In continued support of our military, the Ravens have sponsored a VetDog, aptly naming her Raven, through *America's VetDogs - Veteran's K-9 Corps*. Raven's sponsorship includes support for her room and board, training and any other necessities for her success. America's VetDogs was created to provide enhanced mobility and renewed independence to veterans, active-duty service members and first responders with disabilities. Their mission is to help the men and women who have honorably served our country by matching them with a service dog who will support their daily activities as well as provide motivation to tackle every day challenges. Making a special appearance during the dual practice with the Los Angeles Rams, Raven, the five-month old Black Labrador Retriever, continued her training through interaction with fans, players and coaches. As she continues through intensive behavioral and physical training, Raven will be placed as either a guide, service, seizure response, hearing or PTSD companion.

PLAY 60 GRANT

The Ravens Foundation, Inc. recently awarded \$100,000 in grants to 26 nonprofit organizations around the Baltimore area. Providing up to \$5,000 in financial support to each nonprofit, the Ravens' Play 60 Grant continues to provide for both new and expanding programs that promote physical fitness and/or nutrition education among youth. Since 2006, the Ravens Foundation, Inc. has provided over \$1.2 million towards supporting the fitness and education of youth around the Baltimore area. This year, the Play 60 Grant helped fund a multitude of projects, including interscholastic athletic programs for students with disabilities, like the **Maryland School for the Blind** (pictured below), running clubs, boxing training and after-school mentorship programs. Committed to improving, encouraging and enabling the healthy development of youth in Baltimore and throughout the state of Maryland, the Ravens Foundation, Inc. provides more than \$500,000 annually in grant funding to local nonprofits.



2018 RAVENS SCHOLARS

For the ninth-consecutive year, five outstanding area high school seniors will be awarded with a \$5,000 renewable scholarship (\$20,000 over four years to each scholar). Scholars were chosen based on their remarkable academic achievement, extra-curricular participation and community service. The scholarship, funded by the Ravens Foundation, Inc., enables local youth to continue their education at the collegiate level. Having a long-standing history of service to local communities, the Ravens, once again, partnered with CollegeBound Foundation to encourage and promote the education of the fans who support them. After receiving a record breaking 240 applications, the scholarship committee selected the following students to receive the 2018 Ravens Scholarship: **Adonijah Bourne, Clarity Love, Victoria Able, Kyra Davis and Ashely Pena** (not pictured below). The scholars were honored on field during the Ravens first preseason game against the Los Angeles Rams on August 9th.
