The Ravens welcomed approximately 1,000 fans to the Under Armour Performance Center each day for training camp practices. Additionally, more than 20 non-profits from the Baltimore-area had the chance to see the players in action. Organizations that attended included: Athletes Serving Athletes (ASA), providing a mainstream race experience for disabled athletes, Boys and Girls Clubs, Casey Cares Foundation, providing programs for critically ill children and their families, Ronald McDonald House, Special Olympics Maryland, Police Athletic League and various summer camps from around Baltimore. The Ravens hosted active service members from the U.S. Army, U.S. Air Force, Maryland National Guard and Gold Star Mothers, mothers of soldiers who lost their lives while serving. The Tragedy Assistance Program for Survivors (TAPS), an organization that supports families of fallen service members, as well as veterans from the Wounded Warrior Project were also in attendance. Each community group had the opportunity to meet and greet players and coaches, who signed autographs and took pictures with the guests after practice. This gave the Ravens a chance to show appreciation toward the numerous fans who support them.

ELLICOTT CITY RELIEF

In late July, Howard County, Md., experienced an unprecedented amount of rainfall and flooding. The severe weather destroyed homes, vehicles and infrastructure in Ellicott City. In response to the tragedy, the Ravens teamed up with WIYY 98 Rock radio station to raise funds and awareness for the individuals, families and businesses affected by the flooding. Ravens players, coaches and staff supported efforts by wearing “I heart EC” shirts.
