THE MATCHUP

Coming off a 20-17 victory over the Atlanta Falcons on Sunday to break a seven game losing streak in the debut of **Darren Rizzi** as interim head coach, the New Orleans Saints will play two more games in their three-game homestand, sandwiched by a Week 12 bye. The work during the week to make corrections and improve on a 3-7 record continues when they host the Cleveland Browns (2-7) on Sunday at the Caesars Superdome. Cleveland will be the only AFC North team New Orleans faces in 2024.

The two teams last faced off in 2022 on Christmas Eve, in what was a 17-10 victory for New Orleans in Cleveland, in the coldest starting temperature for a Saints contest. Cleveland leads the overall series, 13-6, but New Orleans has captured the last two games. Four of the last five meetings have been decided by seven points or less, reflecting hard-fought games where the outcomes were not decided until the final full drive each time.

New Orleans goes into the contest at 3-7, with the Saints, Carolina Panthers (3-7) and Tampa Bay Buccaneers (4-6) all logjammed behind the 6-4 Falcons in a competitive NFC South, that grew tighter Sunday with the victory over the Falcons, Carolina's win over the New York Giants and Tampa Bay's loss to the San Francisco 49ers.

New Orleans was led by an efficient and explosive performance through the air from **Derek Carr**, who completed 16-of-25 passes (64.0 pct.) for 269 yards with two touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 126.9 passer rating. Carr and WR **Marquez Valdes-Scantling** connected on two touchdowns.

Seeing his first significant action for the Black and Gold, Valdes-Scantling caught three passes for 109 yards (36.3 avg.). RB **Alvin Kamara** finished with 109 yards from scrimmage as he became the franchise's all-time rushing leader.

The New Orleans defense held the Falcons scoreless on four drives in the fourth quarter to allow Saints to maintain their lead. Three crucial fourth quarter splash plays took place. DE **Cameron Jordan** dropped QB **Kirk Cousins** to force a field goal attempt that was missed, S **Tyrann Mathieu** picked off Cousins in Saints territory and DE **Chase Young** dumped the signal-caller for a significant loss on a sack/forced fumble to preserve the victory.

Special teams also played an important role in the victory. DT **John Rideway III** blocked a 35-yard field goal attempt near the end of the second quarter, K **Blake Grupe** drilled both of his field goal attempts and P **Matthew Hayball** dropped four punts inside-the 20-yard line.

THE HEAD COACHES



In his 32nd year of coaching, his 16th in the National Football League and sixth with the Saints, Darren Rizzi was named interim head coach of the New Orleans Saints on November 4, 2024. Rizzi has coordinated highly successful special teams units for the Miami Dolphins [2010-18] and Saints [2019-present]. He also added assistant head coach responsibilities in 2022 in New Orleans and also had associate head coach duties in Miami from 2017-18.

Rizzi's units have ranked in the top half of NFL writer Rick Gosselin's annual special teams rankings in 12 of the 13 full years that he has served as a coordinator, including first in 2019, fifth in both 2020 and 2021 and second in 2023. Since he entered the NFL coaching ranks in 2009, seven special teams players have been named to eight Pro Bowls under his tutelage. Rizzi has also coached six players to the NFL All-Rookie team in the past ten years.

Over his Saints coaching career, Rizzi's work on special teams have made the kicking game an integral part of New Orleans' success since 2019. Over that period, J.T. Gray's 81 tackles over that period rank first in the NFL. The punting game has produced the top three seasons in club history for punts inside-the-20-yard line. Since 2019, the Saints have excelled in the return game. Over the five-and-a-half season period, the team ranks seventh in the NFL in punt return average [10.3] and second in punt return touchdowns [3]. The coverage units have allowed the third-lowest punt return average [7.1].

Last season, New Orleans finished in the Top 10 in the NFL in 13-of-22 special teams categories, leading or sharing the lead in five of them and finishing second in two others.

A native of Hillsdale, N.J. and graduate of Bergen Catholic High School, Rizzi played tight end at Rhode Island, where he first walked on in 1988. He went on to tally 160 receptions for 2,426 yards [15.2 avg.] and 15 touchdowns in his collegiate career and was a consensus All-American in 1992, earning a degree in speech communications.

Rizzi and his wife, Tracey, have two daughters and three sons.

Stefanski became the 16th coach to win the *Associated Press* NFL Coach of the Year multiple times since its inception in 1957, winning the honors in 2020 and 2023, and joined Pro Football Hall of Famer Forrest Gregg [1976] as the only Browns coaches to win the award.

In his first four seasons as head coach from 2020-23, the Browns posted a 37-30 [.552] record, the highest-regular season winning percentage for the team over a four-year stretch since 1986-89. Stefanski has led the team to two postseason appearances and two 11-win seasons. He joined Pro Football Hall of Famer Paul Brown [1951 and 1953] as the only coaches in team history to record multiple seasons with at least 11 regular-season wins. Before the Browns, he spent 14 seasons [2006-19] with the Minnesota Vikings and moved up the coaching ladder.

Stefanski gained his first league experience with the Vikings in 2006 as assistant to the head coach before transitioning to assistant quarterbacks coach from 2009-13, then spending two seasons tutoring the tight ends [2014-15], one season [2016] as running backs coach, two seasons guiding the quarterbacks [2017-18] and adding the role of interim offensive coordinator for the remaining three games of the 2018 season. The Vikings promoted him to offensive coordinator in 2019.

The Philadelphia, Pa. native played defensive back at Penn [2000-04] and earned a bachelor's degree in communications. Stefanski and his wife Michelle, have two sons, Will and Gabe, and one daughter, Juliet.

LAST MEETING

Saints 17, Browns 10; Dec. 24, 2022 @ FirstEnergy Stadium - With the starting temperature for the game at six degrees, the Saints braved the elements and an initial 10-0 deficit to persevere through worsening weather conditions through the afternoon and score 17 straight points, while holding their opponent scoreless in the second half. QB Andy Dalton capably led the Saints to battle, completing 8-of-15 passes for 92 yards, including four completions to rookie WR Rashid Shaheed for 41 yards and two to RB Alvin Kamara for a gain of 34 yards, including a 29-yarder. Kamara's four-yard rushing touchdown, was the 72nd overall score of his career, tying him for first in franchise record books. TE Taysom Hill carried nine times for 56 yards with one TD, to increase his team-leading total for the season to six rushing and eight overall, with his 22 career rushing touchdowns the most by a Saint to not play tailback.

LAST MEETING

LAST MEETING (Cont.)

Defensively, New Orleans continued their strong play in keeping opponents out of the end zone, keeping their sixth consecutive opponent to 20 points or less. Surrendering only 125 net passing yards, it was the first time New Orleans has held opponents to 125 or lower in two consecutive contests since the 2013 season. The defense was aided by several standout performances, including S Daniel Sorensen who intercepted Cleveland QB Deshaun Watson for a 36-yard return in the third quarter to set up New Orleans' go-ahead score. DE Carl Granderson sacked Watson at the New Orleans 22-yard line on the Browns' final play from scrimmage to seal the victory. S Tyrann Mathieu finished with a game-high 11 tackles (six solo), his highest total as a Saint as he led a secondary missing two starters.

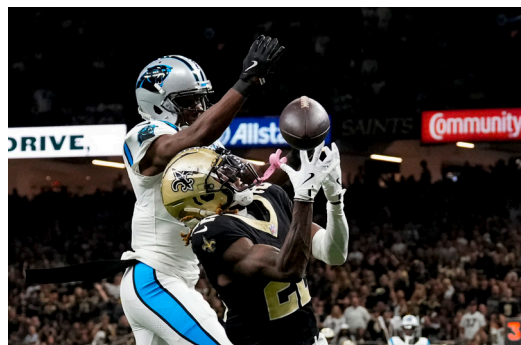
2024 GAME SUMMARIES

WEEK 1: Saints 47, Carolina Panthers 10; September 8, 2024 @ Caesars Superdome - The New Orleans Saints, behind three **Derek Carr** touchdown passes, the power of two rushing touchdowns and four **Blake Grupe** field goals, defeated the visiting Carolina Panthers in a convincing 47-10 performance, at the Caesars Superdome. New Orleans dominated Carolina in all three phases of the contest. The Saints jumped out to a 30-0 lead, scored on their first nine possessions [tying a club record for scores on consecutive possessions] and held the football for 36:39 in time of possession en route to the highest scoring total and most lopsided opening day victory in team history. New Orleans won their sixth consecutive season opener, a club record and the current longest opener winning streak in the National Football League

The New Orleans defense also displayed their mettle, allowing only 193 total net yards of offense by the Panthers and held Carolina to just one of ten third downs.

The Saints defense recorded three takeaways and CB **Alontae Taylor** became the first Saints defensive back to record three sacks in a contest, but fans were excited by the debut of a new-look offense that helped the Saints control the clock with a rushing game that gained 180 yards and two touchdowns largely behind **Alvin Kamara's** 83 yards. Carr completed 19-of-23 passes [82.6 pct.] for 200 yards with three touchdown passes, zero interceptions and a 142.5 passer rating. The New Orleans defense harassed Carolina QB **Bryce Young** all day, as he completed only 13-of-30 passes for 161 yards with two interceptions and a 32.8 passer rating.

- With the victory, the Saints improved to 23-35 in season openers and extend their club-record winning streak of season openers to six straight, currently the longest streak in the NFL.
- WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed** led New Orleans with 73 receiving yards on three receptions [24.3 avg.] with one touchdown reception from 59 yards out, the longest play of the game. Including 60 punt return yards, sparked by a 47-yard runback and a 33-yard kickoff return, Shaheed finished with 163 all-purpose yards.
- Carr connected with two of his tight ends, **Juwan Johnson** and **Foster Moreau** for touchdowns.
- 17 players made their Saints debuts: T **Taliese Fuaga**, G **Lucas Patrick**, LB **Willie Gay Jr.**, DB **Will Harris**, QB **Jake Haener**, WR **Cedrick Wilson Jr.**, CB **Kool-Aid McKinstry**, WR **Bub Means**, CB **Rico Payton**, P **Matthew Hayball**, LB **Khaleke Hudson**, LB **Anfernee Orji**, OL **Oli Udoh**, WR **Mason Tipton**, DTs **Kendal Vickers** and **Khristian Boyd** and DE **Chase Young**.



2024 GAME SUMMARIES

WEEK 2: New Orleans Saints 44, Dallas Cowboys 19; Sept. 15, 2024 @ AT&T Stadium - The Saints posted an impressive road victory at Dallas behind the powerful offensive firepower of RB **Alvin Kamara**, the arm of QB **Derek Carr**, the hands of WRs **Chris Olave** and **Rashid Shaheed** and two interceptions by the defense.

The Saints struck first on the opening drive as Carr led the offense down the field on a sequence ending with Kamara rushing for a five-yard touchdown. At the conclusion of Dallas' first drive, K **Brandon Aubrey** booted a 52-yard field goal. New Orleans struck right back for their second score of the first quarter on a 70-yard pass play from Carr to Shaheed to put New Orleans up 14-3.

Leading 35-16 at halftime, the Cowboys got the ball out of the second half and New Orleans moved Dallas out of the red zone in the first drive, when DT **Bryan Bresee** sacked QB **Dak Prescott** and forced him to fumble before it was recovered by Dallas at the New Orleans 22-yard line, forcing a 40-yard field goal. On New Orleans' next 13-play, 70-yard drive, Kamara capped things off with a seven-yard touchdown, his fourth score of the day.

In the fourth quarter, Carr was intercepted on a tipped pass, but on the next play, New Orleans got the ball back on an interception by S **Tyrann Mathieu**, his second takeaway of the season. On the ensuing drive, New Orleans closed out the scoring in the contest with a 26-yard field goal by K **Blake Grupe**. Carr completed 11-of-16 passes for 243 yards with two touchdown throws and one interception, while scoring one rushing touchdown for a 125.0 passer rating. Kamara led the club in rushing with a game-high 115 yards on 20 carries with three touchdowns to go with two receptions for 65 yards, including a career-long 57-yard scoring grab on a screen pass. Shaheed led the Saints in receiving with four grabs for 96 yards with the deep touchdown, reaching the end zone in his third consecutive contest dating back to 2023.

The Saints defense harassed Prescott, sacking him three times and forcing two interceptions. CB **Alontae Taylor** led the team with a career-high nine tackles, while CB **Paulson Adebo** had his first interception of the season and DE **Carl Granderson** picked up 1.5 sacks.

- The win marked the first time the Saints have won in Dallas since a 34-31 overtime victory on December 23, 2012.
- A stingy Saints run defense held the Cowboys to 68 yards rushing on 21 carries [3.2 avg.].
- The 91 points by New Orleans in their first two games are tied for the second-most in NFL history through the first two games of a season, behind the Saints' 93 point total in 2009.



WEEK 3: Philadelphia Eagles 15, New Orleans Saints 12; Sept. 22, 2024 @ Caesars Superdome - Philadelphia S **Reed Blankenship** intercepted Saints QB **Derek Carr** with 48 seconds left to preserve a 15-12 win over New Orleans in the Caesars Superdome.

The Saints had overcome an unsuccessful fourth-and-one conversion attempts and a 65-yard touchdown run by Eagles RB **Saquon Barkley** to take the lead in the fourth quarter with just over two minutes left, 12-7, with a field goal and a 13-yard touchdown connection from Carr and WR **Chris Olave**.

However, upon the Eagles getting the ball back, Philadelphia QB **Jalen Hurts** completed a pass to TE **Dallas Goedert** for a 61-yard gain and Barkley punched in a touchdown from four yards in. The Eagles improved to 2-1, while the Saints fell to 2-1.

Carr completed 14-of-25 passes for 142 yards with one touchdown and one interception. Olave had six receptions for 86 yards, including a 13-yard touchdown catch. RB **Alvin Kamara** rushed for 87 yards and caught three passes for 40 yards from 127 total yards from scrimmage.

DE **Carl Granderson** had 1.5 sacks and a forced fumble and DT **Bryan Bresee** tied a career-high with two takedowns. S **Tyrann Mathieu** had an interception, giving him takeaways in four straight games for the first time in his career dating back to the 2023 season finale. CB **Paulson Adebo** led the team with a career-high ten solo tackles and one pass breakup.

EAGLES VS. SAINTS (CONT.)

- The loss snapped a four-game winning streak, and a four-game home win streak.
- For the third consecutive game, the Saints scored on their first offensive possession with the Grupe field goal. It marked the first time since Weeks 17 and 18 of the 2022 season and the 2023 season opener, that the Saints scored on their opening possession in three consecutive games.
- Mathieu's interception was the 35th of his career since coming into the league in 2013. He and Minnesota's Harrison Smith are tied as the NFL's interception leaders among active players.
- Dating back to Week 17 of the 2023 season, New Orleans has won the takeaway battle in five consecutive contests.

WEEK 4: Atlanta Falcons 26, New Orleans Saints 24; September 29, 2024 @ Mercedes-Benz Stadium

- Despite several significant injuries going into the contest and in-game, the Saints took the Falcons to the limit before dropping a 26-24 heartbreaker at Mercedes-Benz Stadium.

Atlanta K **Younghoe Koo's** 58-yard field goal with two seconds left was the difference. New Orleans rebounded from a fumbled punt return for a touchdown early in the first quarter to reach the end zone on rushing touchdowns by TE **Taysom Hill** on their first two offensive possessions, his first two scores of the season, before departing with an abdomen injury.

Atlanta took the lead back in the second quarter at 17-14 on a 53-yard Koo field goal and a 44-yard **Troy Andersen** interception return for a touchdown. Koo added to the scoring with a 44-yard field goal midway through the third quarter and then **Blake Grupe** and Koo traded field goals with the Falcons taking the end for the majority of the third and fourth quarters until QB **Derek Carr** engineered a nine-play, 42-yard drive ending with a one-yard touchdown run by RB **Alvin Kamara** with one minute left to pull ahead, 24-23. But Atlanta rallied, as the Falcons gained 30 yards on a pass interference penalty to set up Koo's 58-yard kick.

WEEK 5: Kansas City Chiefs 26, New Orleans Saints 13; October 7, 2024 @ GEHA Field at Arrowhead Stadium - Despite missing five starters due to various injuries, the Saints put forth a valiant effort in a 26-13 loss to the defending Super Bowl champion Kansas City Chiefs on Monday Night Football, closing to within three points early in the fourth quarter before the Chiefs had a late ten-point scoring outburst. After falling behind 10-0 in the contest, New Orleans moved to within three points midway through the second quarter when QB **Derek Carr** found WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed** for a 43-yard touchdown pass to cap a seven-play, 74-yard drive.

But after Kansas City milked the clock for a 15-play, 44-yard drive that ended with a 34-yard field goal by K **Harrison Butker**, the Chiefs forced a quick three-and-out and drove down the field for a 28-yard field goal. The two successful kicks late in the second quarter gave the Chiefs a 13-7 halftime lead.

New Orleans would rally with a 37-yard interception return by DT **Khalen Saunders** that set up a six-yard touchdown connection between Carr and TE **Foster Moreau**, but the Chiefs then ran down the field in five-plays and 68 yards, extending their lead to ten on a three-yard rushing touchdown by rookie WR **Xavier Worthy**.

WEEK 6: Tampa Bay Buccaneers 51, Saints 27; October 13, 2024 @ Caesars Superdome

- With the Buccaneers evacuated to New Orleans for their practice week due to Hurricane Milton, the Saints got caught in a storm of emotion and offensive production by Tampa Bay in a loss that dropped them to 2-4. Tampa Bay, who scored 24 unanswered points in the second half after trailing 27-24 at halftime, had 595 total yards of offense.

In the contest, QB **Spencer Rattler** made his first career NFL start in place of an injured **Derek Carr** [oblique]. Rattler completed 22-of-40 passes for 243 yards with a ten-yard touchdown pass to fellow rookie wide receiver **Bub Means** and two interceptions. Rattler also utilized his feet with four carries for 27 yards.

Buccaneers QB **Baker Mayfield** overcame three second quarter interceptions to complete 24-of-36 passes for 325 yards with four touchdown passes. He was aided by a ground game that added 277 yards and two touchdowns.

Mayfield and the Buccaneers jumped out to a 17-0 first quarter lead, but New Orleans would rally. Special teams provided a spark to put the team back into it. WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed** returned a punt 54 yards for a touchdown early in the second quarter to put the Saints within seven. On Tampa Bay's next possession, CB **Paulson Adebo** intercepted Mafield and K **Blake Grupe** drilled a 29-yard field goal.

Two plays after the field goal, S **Johnathan Abram** intercepted a tipped pass and returned it 30 yards to the Tampa Bay ten-yard line. Rattler then connected with fellow rookie WR **Bub Means** for a ten-yard touchdown to put New Orleans ahead 20-17. After Tampa Bay took the lead quickly on a Mayfield touchdown pass, the Saints responded with a seven-play, 70-yard drive that ended with a four-yard rushing touchdown by RB **Alvin Kamara** to give the Saints would would be a 27-24 halftime lead.

The two clubs traded punts on the first two possessions of the third quarter, but on New Orleans' second possession of the quarter, Tampa Bay turned up the heat on Rattler with two straight sacks on first and second down, forcing a punt. On Tampa Bay's next drive, Mayfield connected with WR **Chris Godwin** on a 55-yard touchdown to give the Buccaneers the lead for good on the afternoon.

WEEK 7: Denver Broncos 33, Saints 10; October 17, 2024 @ Caesars Superdome - Difficulties on third down and a standout performance on the ground by the Broncos offense combined to give the Saints their fifth consecutive loss.

The Broncos and Saints traded punts on their first possessions. Denver scored when they got the ball back for their second possession on a 46-yard **Wil Lutz** field goal. Broncos LB **Cody Barton** then sacked Saints QB **Spencer Rattler** and forced him to fumble with the recovery by LB **Kwon Alexander**. at the Denver 45-yard line, setting up a 32-yard Lutz kick. The Saints were forced to punt on their first possession of the second quarter and Broncos QB **Bo Nix** engineered an eight-play, 86-yard drive that ended with an eight-yard touchdown run by RB **Javonte Williams** to give Denver a 13-0 lead.

Nix matched a Saints field goal on his and Denver's next possession, successfully running a two-minute drill that gave the Broncos a 16-3 halftime lead following a 52-yard Lutz field goal.

Denver broke open the contest in the third quarter, where they forced three New Orleans punts and added on a 38-yard field goal by Lutz and a five-yard rushing touchdown by Williams to take a 26-3 edge going into the final period.

The Broncos scored their final points of the evening with just over four minutes remaining in the fourth quarter when CB **Ja'Quan McMillian** sacked Rattler and forced him to fumble, with the ball recovered by Barton and returned 52 yards for a touchdown. With QB **Jake Haener** entering the contest to allow Rattler to rest a hip pointer injury, New Orleans would achieve some offensive thrythm to end the contest when Haener engineered a 11-play, 79-yard drive that ended with a 12-yard touchdown pass to WR **Cedrick Wilson Jr.**, the second-year signal-caller's first career touchdown pass and the sixth-year wideout's first scoring grab as a Saint.



WEEK 8: Los Angeles Chargers 26, Saints 8; October 27, 2024 @ SoFi Stadium - Los Angeles QB **Justin Herbert** threw two touchdowns and had a career-long 38-yard rush, while RB **J.K Dobbins** rushed for 57 yards and pounded in a score to erase an early 2-0 deficit in the Saints' return to Southern California, where they held the first portion of their training camp.

The early lead for New Orleans came on an abated punt play, where LS **Josh Harris** fumbled the ball and when it was picked up by P **JK Scott**, TE **Taysom Hill** tackled him and forced him to fumble with the ball going out of the end zone for a safety. Late in the first quarter, Herbert carried for a 38-yard gain on a drive and the early Saints lead was erased by a 46-yard **Cameron Dicker** field goal on the first play of the second quarter. In the second quarter, Los Angeles embarked on a 15-play, 90-yard drive that ended with a one-yard rushing touchdown by **Dobbins**, which following a missed extra point, extended the lead to 9-2. New Orleans got the ball back with 1:37 left in the first half at their 30 and drove to cut the deficit to 9-5 on a 40-yard field goal by **Blake Grupe**.

The Chargers took a 16-5 lead on a 60-yard touchdown connection from Herbert to WR **Ladd McConkey**. New Orleans got the ball back and took advantage of a Chargers unnecessary roughness penalty, followed two plays later by a 14-yard completion from QB **Spencer Rattler** to WR **Chris Olave** to the Los Angeles 38-yard line. However, a holding penalty assessed to T **Trevor Penning** knocked New Orleans out of field goal range. The Saints forced a three and out, powered by a sack by DT **Khalen Saunders** and QB **Jake Haener** entered the contest in place of Rattler. Haener, then led New Orleans on eight-play drive that ended with a 43-yard field goal to put the Saints within eight.

On the next drive that led into the fourth quarter, Herbert connected with WR **Joshua Palmer** for a 45-yard gain, that set up a 29-yard field goal. The clubs then traded punts on their next two possessions, with the Saints eventually reaching Chargers territory on a drive powered by a 28-yard connection from Haener to Olave. However New Orleans was set back by a failed 44-yard field goal attempt by Grupe. On the following possession, the Chargers drove 66 yards in nine plays and McConkey hauled in a nine-yard touchdown pass from Herbert for a 26-8 lead with 3:22 remaining.

Rattler was 12-of-24 passing for 156 yards and Haener completed nine-of-17 throws for 122 yards. Olave, caught eight passes for 107 yards in the team's first 100-yard receiving performance of the season and the ninth of his career.

Los Angeles out-gained New Orleans, 378-366. The Saints were 2-for-16 on third down conversions, while the Chargers were only 3-of-12 on third down attempts.



WEEK 9: Carolina Panthers 23, New Orleans Saints 22; November 3, 2024 @ Bank of America Stadium - An inspired effort on offense by RB **Alvin Kamara** was spoiled by Carolina RB **Chuba Hubbard's** game-winning 16-yard rushing touchdown with 2:18 remaining. The Saints were unable to drive within field goal range on their final possession. After two first quarter Saints field goals, the Panthers had staked a 7-6 lead midway through the second quarter with a three-yard touchdown connection from QB **Bryce Young** to rookie WR **Xavier Legette**.

New Orleans took the lead back on a seven-yard touchdown run by TE **Taysom Hill**, but Carolina moved back to within three with a 48-yard kick by K **Eddie Pineiro** with 38 seconds left in the first half. Coming out of halftime, the Panthers chewed up 5:05 off the clock on a nine-play, 86-yard drive that ended with a one-yard rushing touchdown by Hubbard. New Orleans answered and moved to within one point on a 51-yard field goal by **Blake Grupe** and then the defense forcing a three-and-out.

In a drive that ran into the fourth quarter, New Orleans capitalized on the three-and out with starting field position at the 30-yard line and with Kamara accounting for 40 yards from scrimmage on the drive, QB **Derek Carr** found TE **Foster Moreau** for a 17-yard touchdown.

The clubs traded jabs for the rest of the game, starting with an acrobatic interception by Saints CB **Shemar Jean-Charles** making his first career pick in his first game started.

On the ensuing drive, New Orleans was plagued by two holding penalties that set them back at their 18-yard line. The Saints got back to their 46-yard line, but were forced to punt. New Orleans again forced a three-and-out, but a face mask penalty assessed to T **Trevor Penning** on their first play from scrimmage on the drive set them back at their 13-yard line and eventually forced a punt.

After two deep pass attempts by Young that went incomplete, the second-year passer connected with Legette for a 26-yard gain on third-and-ten to the New Orleans 38-yard line. On the next play, Saints LB **Demario Davis** was assessed a 22-yard pass interference penalty, setting up the 16-yard go-ahead run by Hubbard. On the two-point attempt, Young was sacked by Saints DE **Chase Young**.

Starting at their 20-yard line, New Orleans got off to a promising start by collecting 20 yards between a four-yard carry by Kamara and a 16-yard completion from Carr to TE **Juwan Johnson**. But a sack for a six-yard loss by Panthers DT **Charles Harris** set New Orleans back to third-and-16. However after Kamara gained back 12 yards on a screen, WR **Cedrick Wilson** was unable to grasp a pass intended for him near the sideline and the Panthers would prevail for their second victory of the season.



- Kamara tied his career-high with 155 yards rushing, 12 yards short of the franchise career rushing yardage record. It was his tenth-career 100-yard rushing performance. He had a career-best 215 total yards from scrimmage, the highest total in the NFL this season and the fifth-highest single-game total in Saints history.
- Hill's seven-yard rushing touchdown was the 41st total score of his career, putting him a tie for ninth place in club record books with RB Pierre Thomas.

WEEK 10: Saints 20, Atlanta Falcons 17; November 10, 2024 @ Caesars Superdome - New Orleans broke a seven-game losing streak, holding on to defeat their division rivals as **Darren Rizzi** was successful in his debut as interim head coach.

New Orleans was led by an efficient and explosive performance through the air from **Derek Carr**, who completed 16-of-25 passes (64.0 pct.) for 269 yards with two touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 126.9 passer rating. Carr and WR **Marquez Valdes-Scantling** connected on two touchdowns.

Seeing his first significant action for the Black and Gold, Valdes-Scantling caught three passes for 109 yards (36.3 avg.). RB **Alvin Kamara** finished with 109 yards from scrimmage as he became the franchise's all-time rushing leader.

The New Orleans defense held the Falcons scoreless on four drives in the fourth quarter to allow Saints to maintain their lead. Three crucial fourth quarter splash plays took place. DE **Cameron Jordan** dropped QB **Kirk Cousins** to force a field goal attempt that was missed, S **Tyrann Mathieu** picked off Cousins in Saints territory and DE **Chase Young** dumped the signal-caller for a significant loss on a sack/forced fumble to preserve the victory.

Special teams also played an important role in the victory. DT **John Rideway III** blocked a 35-yard field goal attempt near the end of the second quarter, K **Blake Grupe** drilled both of his field goal attempts and P **Matthew Hayball** dropped four punts inside-the 20-yard line.

WEEK 2: NFC Offensive Player of the Week, FedEx Ground Player of the Week and LFG (Tom Brady-FOX) Player of the Game Award - RB Alvin Kamara

Made a significant impact in the running game and passing game in New Orleans' 44-19 win at the Dallas Cowboys. Kamara carried 20 times for 115 yards (5.8 avg.) with three touchdowns and caught two passes for 65 yards, including a career-long 57-yard touchdown.

WEEK 9: NFL Way To Play Award - DB Shemar-Jean Charles

Jean-Charles was honored for his first career interception, which he hauled in with 9:22 left to go in the fourth quarter of the Saints' game against the Carolina Panthers, ripping the ball right out of Panthers wide receiver Xavier Legette's hands. The Saints cornerback will receive a \$5,000 USA Football Equipment Grant from NFL Foundation for the youth or high school football program of his choice.

TEAM NOTES

EVANS TO BE INDUCTED INTO SAINTS RING OF HONOR ON SUNDAY

Former Saints G Jahri Evans will be inducted into the club's Ring of Honor during a halftime ceremony of Sunday's contest.

Evans, 6-4, 318, was originally a fourth round draft pick (108th overall) of the Saints in 2006 out of Bloomsburg and developed into an anchor for one of the most dominant offenses in NFL history during his tenure with the Saints. The Philadelphia, Pa. native started all 169 regular season games he played in at right guard and all of the team's ten postseason contests during that period, including all three during the 2009 campaign when the Saints captured Super Bowl XLIV.

A five-time *Associated Press* All-Pro (2009-13), Evans was selected first-team four times, twice as much as any other Saint. Evans was selected to six straight Pro Bowls (2009-14) and was named to the Pro Football Hall of Fame's 2010's All-Decade Team. During his 11-year tenure, the Saints were ranked first in the NFL in total offense (net yards per game) six times (2006, 2008-09, 2011, 2014 and 2016) and in scoring (points per game) twice (2008-09). The 274 sacks surrendered by the Saints offensive line from 2006-16 were the lowest total in the NFL over the period and the unit was recognized twice (2009 and 2011) as the winner of the Madden Protector Offensive Line Award.

Evans closed out his playing career starting 14 games at right guard for the Green Bay Packers in 2017, finishing with 183 total games played/started. A Pro Football Hall of Fame semifinalist in 2023 and finalist in 2024, Evans began his coaching career as an offensive assistant for the Saints in 2023.

FAMILY TIES

Numerous Saints players, coaches and administrators are not the only members of their families to make a name for themselves in pro football. 17 Saints players, coaches or front office staff have relatives who have played, coached or served in the front office in the NFL.

Offensive Coordinator Klint Kubiak - Father, Gary, played quarterback for the Denver Broncos from 1983-91 and served as an assistant for 15 years for Denver, San Francisco and Minnesota. Gary Kubiak was head coach of the Houston Texans from 2006-13 and the Denver Broncos from 2015-16, including the Super Bowl 50 champions. Brother Klay, serves as the 49ers passing game specialist. Brother Klein works in the Dallas Cowboys player personnel department.

Senior Vice President/Asst. General Manager-College Personnel Jeff Ireland - Stepson of Chiefs Hall of Fame linebacker/center E.J. Holub. Grandson of Philadelphia Eagles running back and Chicago Bears personnel executive Jim Parmer.

National Scout Terry Wooden - Brother, Jojo is Senior Director of Player Personnel for the Las Vegas Raiders.

Quarterback Derek Carr - Older brother, David was the No. 1 overall pick in the 2002 NFL Draft by the Houston Texans and played quarterback in the league for 11 seasons with Houston, Carolina, the New York Giants and San Francisco. Uncle, Lon Boyett, played tight end for Tampa Bay, the Raiders and San Francisco.

Linebacker Demario Davis - Cousin of the late Steve McNair, the standout quarterback for the Tennessee Titans (1995-2005) and Baltimore Ravens (2006-07).

Tight End Taysom Hill - Brother-in-law, David Nixon, played linebacker and on special teams for the Oakland Raiders (2009), Houston Texans (2010) and St. Louis Rams (2010-11).

Tight End Juwan Johnson - Brother, George, played defensive end for eight years in the NFL with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, Minnesota Vikings, Detroit Lions and Saints.

Defensive End Cameron Jordan - Father, Steve, had a prolific 13-year career at tight end for the Minnesota Vikings, with six Pro Bowl selections, being inducted into their Ring of Honor.

Center/guard Erik McCoy - Cousin of former Dolphins and Buccaneers running back Jorvorski Lane.

Linebacker Nephi Sewell - One brother Penei, is a member of the Detroit Lions after getting selected seventh overall in the 2021 NFL Draft. Another brother, Noah, was selected by the Chicago Bears in the fifth round of the 2023 NFL Draft.

Practice Squad wide receiver Equanimeous St. Brown - Younger brother, Amon-Ra, plays wide receiver for the Lions.

Linebacker Pete Werner - Father, Greg, played nine games at right end and on special teams for the New York Jets in 1989 and went to training camp with the Philadelphia Eagles in 1990.

Wide receiver Cedrick Wilson Jr. - Father, Cedrick Sr., is a former NFL wideout, who played for seven years in the league, including a Super Bowl championship with the Pittsburgh Steelers.

Area Scout Joey Vitt - Father, Joe Vitt, is a long-time NFL assistant coach, who served as assistant head coach/linebackers of the Saints from 2006-16 and also had coaching stints with the Seattle Seahawks, Baltimore Colts, Los Angeles/St. Louis Rams, Kansas City Chiefs, New York Jets and Denver Broncos.

Area Scout Matt Phillips - Father, Ted, worked in the Chicago Bears front office from 1983-2022, including serving his last 24 years as team president.

ROSTER ROLL CALL

On the Saints active roster as of November 11, 31 were on the active roster, a reserve list of the practice squad at the end of the 2023 season. Among newcomers, the roster includes nine unrestricted free agents, one veteran free agent, one trade acquisition, six draft picks and five rookie free agents.

Of the players, 23 have less than four years of previous NFL experience, including ten rookies. The following is a breakdown of New Orleans' roster by years of experience (year entering): 14 years - 1, 13 years - 1, 12 years - 1, 11 years - 1, 8 years - 6, 7 years - 5, 6 years - 5, 5 years - 5, 4 years - 5, 3 years - 3, 2 years - 6, 1 year - 2, rookies - 11.

HIGHER EDUCATION

39 colleges and universities are represented on the Saints' 53-man roster. Of that total, eight are represented by multiple Saints, three from Oregon and Fresno State and two from Appalachian State, BYU, Ohio State, Mississippi State, LSU, Notre Dame, Tennessee, Northern Iowa, South Carolina and Vanderbilt.

TURNOVER RATIO LEADER

After finishing 31st in the NFL at -11 in 2022, New Orleans finished the 2023 season tied for third in turnover differential at +11 and ranked second in the NFC. The Saints won the turnover battle in eight games in 2023. In 2024, they are tied for ninth at +4, having not turned over the ball in the last three games.

TAKEAWAY TURNAROUND

After finishing tied for 31st in the NFL in 2022 with only 14 takeaways, New Orleans more than doubled that figure in 2023 with 29 forced turnovers on defense and special teams, ranking fourth in the NFL. Their 16 forced turnovers in 2024 are tied for ninth in the league with 12 interceptions and three fumble recoveries.

BUCKING THE ODDS

The Saints have a long tradition of finding players as free agents signed after the draft that make an impact immediately or after developing their careers initially on the practice squad. Several undrafted Saints on the roster play key roles on offense, defense and special teams, including six undrafted rookies who are on the 53-man roster.

Over the past 21 years, the Saints [2018-22: DB **J.T. Gray**, WR/RS **Deonte Harty** and WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed**] and San Diego/Los Angeles Chargers [2003: G **Kris Dielman**, TE **Antonio Gates** and WR **Kasim Osgood**] are the only two teams to have three players signed as undrafted free agents be selected to a Pro Bowl for the team that originally signed them.

Originally signed as an undrafted free agent in 2018, spending part of his rookie season on the practice squad, Gray's 83 special teams tackles since 2019 rank first in the NFL, as he has been selected as both an AP first-team All-Pro and Pro Bowler. In 2023, the special teams captain finished the season with 11 coverage stops to lead the team and tie for 12th in the league, despite missing three contests with injuries. In 2024, he is ranked first on the team with 18 stops and had a blocked punt on Sept. 22 vs. Philadelphia, adding three tackles and one forced fumble.

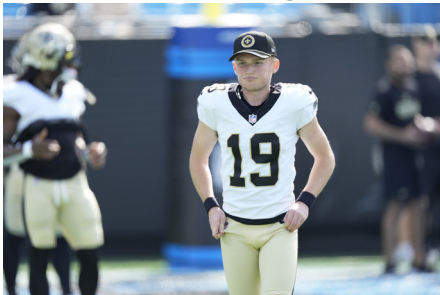
DE **Carl Granderson** joined the club in 2019 as an undrafted free agent out of Wyoming and has appeared in 81 regular season games with 34 starts, posting 213 tackles (124 solo), 26.5 sacks for a loss of 169 yards, four passes defensed, four forced fumbles and two recoveries. In 2023, Granderson earned the starting right end position and posted a career-high 78 tackles (44 solo), led the team with a career-best 8.5 sacks for a loss of 55 yards, defensed one pass and forced a fumble and recovered one.

BROWNS VS. SAINTS

Granderson's 78 stops ranked fifth in the National Football League among defensive linemen and were the most by a Saints lineman since 2004. He has opened all ten games in 2024 and has recorded 34 tackles (21 solo), 3.5 sacks, five stops for loss, two passes defensed and one forced fumble to lead the defensive line in stops.



Joining New Orleans following the 2023 NFL Draft, after a graduate transfer season at Notre Dame and playing most of his college career at Arkansas State, **K Blake Grupe** won a preseason competition to handle placekicking duties and in two seasons, has drilled 48-of-56 field goal attempts (85.7 pct.), including 18-of-19 kicks (94.7 pct.) in 2024 with a career-long of 57 yards in the season-opening win over Carolina. Dating back to the Dec. 17, 2023 win over the New York Giants until a fourth quarter miss on Oct. 27 at the Los Angeles Chargers, Grupe had made 19 consecutive field goals, the longest streak of his career and tied for sixth-longest in franchise history. He has made 14 straight in home contests.



New Orleans signed P **Matthew Hayball** out of Vanderbilt following the NFL Draft. The West Adelaide, Australia native finished as Vandy's all-time leader in punting average (46.5) and was a consensus second-team All-American in 2023, when he ranked seventh nationally in net (43.1). Hayball won a training camp competition to secure the job. In ten games, he has punted 44 times with a 40.8 net punting average, with his 24 inside the 20-yard line tied for first in the NFL.

Signing with New Orleans following the 2024 NFL Draft, S **Millard Bradford** was a five-year letterman and two-time Honorable Mention All-Big 12 selection at TCU, finishing his Horned Frog career with 231 stops (175 solo), 16.5 tackles for loss, one sack for a nine-yard loss, four interceptions, 21 passes defensed, two forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. After starting the season on the practice squad, the Helotes, Texas native was signed to the active roster on Nov. 2 and has played in the last two games on special teams.

TE **Dallin Holker** was signed by New Orleans after a standout graduate transfer campaign at Colorado State, where he posted 64 receptions for 767 yards with six touchdowns, the highest total of yardage and scoring grabs in the college regular season by an Football Bowl Subdivision tight end. Holker's performance in the offseason and training camp secured a roster spot behind Johnson, Taysom Hill and Foster Moreau. Holker recorded his first career special teams tackle on Sunday at Carolina.

WR **Jermaine Jackson** signed a college free agent contract in the spring, playing his final four years at Idaho after starting his college career at the College of San Mateo (Calif.). In 2023, the Oakland, Calif. native was one of the most dynamic returners in college, bringing back 18 punts for 332 yards (18.4 avg.) with two touchdowns to go with 18 kickoff returns for 478 yards (26.6 avg.) and 48 receptions for 593 yards (12.4 avg.) with two touchdowns. Following Shaheed's season-ending knee injury, Jackson has handled return duties in four contests, returning seven punts for 68 yards (9.7 avg.) and eight kickoffs for 187 yards (23.4 avg.). On Sunday vs. Atlanta, Jackson had a career-long 18-yard run-back.

BUCKING THE ODDS (CONT.)

TE **Juwan Johnson** first led Saints tight ends with four touchdown receptions in 2021, converting to the position that offseason after playing wideout in college and as a rookie in 2020, signed as an undrafted free agent from Oregon. In 2022, he led the Black and Gold tight ends in receiving with 42 grabs for 508 yards with a club-best and career-high seven touchdowns, tied for third at the position in the NFL. Johnson led the team's tight ends with 37 grabs for 368 yards with four touchdown grabs in 2023. Johnson has led the Saints with 12 receiving touchdowns over the past three seasons, tied for fifth over that period among league National Football League tight ends.

In 2024, Johnson quickly recovered from foot surgery in June and has played in all ten games, recording 22 receptions for 247 yards with one touchdown. Johnson has combined with Taysom Hill and Foster Moreau to form an effective tight end trio.

After originally signing as an undrafted free agent out of Vanderbilt in 2023, where he led the Commodores in tackles in each of his final three seasons, LB **Anfernee Orji** received the opportunity to see extensive snaps in practice in training camp due to injuries to teammates Demario Davis and Pete Werner. He ranks second on the team with 12 coverage stops and has also added 15 defensive tackles. [nine solo].

CB **Rico Payton** signed a college free agent contract in the spring, playing his final four years at Pittsburg State. As a senior in 2023, the St. Louis native recorded 35 tackles with four interceptions and 15 passes defensed. Payton secured a roster spot with his performance in training camp practices and preseason games, leading the team with five passes defensed and adding seven defensive tackles and one coverage stop in three contests. Payton has contributed on both defense and special teams in the first eight games with one pass breakup and seven coverage stops, including one on Sunday vs. Atlanta.

WR **Mason Tipton** stuck on the 53-man roster after showing bright spots in training camp practices, following a college career at Yale, where he posted 132 receptions for 1,067 yards with 19 TDs. In 2024, he has 14 receptions for 99 yards.

SAINTS BY THE NUMBERS

6 - In the Sept. 15 44-19 win at Dallas, New Orleans scored touchdowns on their first six offensive possessions for only the second time in franchise history, the other occurring on Dec. 21, 2008 at Detroit. The Saints have won a franchise-record six consecutive season openers dating back to 2019. The six-game opener winning streak is the longest current streak in the National Football League.

8 - Ring of Honor members, including guard Jahri Evans, who will be inducted at halftime on Sunday, vs. Cleveland.

9 - In the Sept. 8 opening win over Carolina, New Orleans scored on nine straight possessions, their first nine of the contest, tying the club record previously set in 2011 and 2018.

10 - With his second quarter two-yard touchdown reception from quarterback Derek Carr on Nov. 5, 2023, vs. Chicago, tight end Taysom Hill became the first player since QB/HB Frank Gifford to have at least ten career rushing touchdowns, ten career passing touchdowns and ten career receiving touchdowns.

11 - The number of rookies on the 53-man roster, including five draft picks [tackle Taliese Fuaga, cornerback Kool-Aid McKinstry, defensive tackle Khristian Boyd, linebacker Jaylan Ford, and quarterback Spencer Rattler] and six free agents [punter Matthew Hayball, safety Millard Bradford, tight end Dallin Holker, wide receiver Jermaine Jackson, cornerback Rico Payton and wide receiver Mason Tip-ton].

19 - Before a fourth quarter miss on Oct. 27, at the L.A. Chargers, second-year kicker Blake Grupe made consecutive field goal attempts dating back to the 2023 season, tied for the sixth-longest streak in franchise history.

18 - Number of interceptions by New Orleans in 2023, tied for third in the NFL, more than doubling and nearly tripling their 2022 total of seven. The Saints' 12 interceptions in 2024 through ten games are fourth in the National Football league.

28 - Number of teams DE Cameron Jordan has a sack against. The clubs Jordan has not recorded a takedown against are Baltimore, Kansas City, and the New York Jets.

32 - RB Alvin Kamara needs 32 receptions to surpass Marcus Allen [587] for the fifth-most receptions by a running back in NFL history. Only Larry Centers [827], Marshall Faulk [767], LaDainian Tomlinson [624] and Keith Byars [610] have more. Kamara has 556 career receptions.

36 -With 36 career interceptions, S Tyrann Mathieu is the NFL's active leader in picks.

39 - Career number of 300-yard passing games by QB Derek Carr, ninth in the NFL since coming into the league in 2014.

47 - Players sacked by Jordan in his career.

57 - Kamara had a career-long 57-yard touchdown reception in the Sept. 15 win at Dallas.

58 - The club is in its 58th season of play in 2024.

60 - Club-record number of rushing touchdowns by Kamara, the second-highest league total since he was drafted by the Saints in 2017. The total is tied for 53rd all-time after he rushed for one score on Oct. 13, vs. Tampa Bay. With one rushing touchdown on Sunday vs. Cleveland, he would move into a tie for 50th.

75 - Kamara's 75 receptions in 2023 led NFC tailbacks and ranked second in the NFL at running back. With 75 catches in 2024, he would become the first running back in NFL history with at least 75 grabs in six career seasons. In 2024, Kamara's 51 receptions leads both his team in receiving and league running backs.

With one touchdown Sunday, Kamara would move into a tie for 53rd and with two, would move into a tie for 52nd.

118.5 - Career sacks by Jordan, first in team records and ranked 23rd all-time in the National Football League. With 1.5 takedowns, he would become the 23rd player with 120 career sacks.

166 - Number of regular season games quarterback Derek Carr has started in his career, the most by a signal-caller since 2014.

180 - Number of total yards from scrimmage by Kamara on September 15 at Dallas. Combined with his four touchdowns on Sept. 15 and a 172-yard, six-touchdown performance on Christmas day in 2020 vs. Minnesota, he became the fifth player in the Super Bowl era with multiple career games with at least 150 scrimmage yards and four touchdowns, joining Pro Football Hall of Famers LaDainian Tomlinson [four games], Marshall Faulk [three] and Jerry Rice [two], as well as Clinton Portis [two].

215 - Career-high number of total yards from scrimmage by Kamara on Nov. 10 at Carolina. The 215 is the highest single-game total in the NFL this season and the fifth-highest total in Saints history.

253 - Number of career touchdown passes by Carr, tied with Andy Dalton for 25th in NFL record books. Indianapolis Colts signal caller Joe Flacco and Dan Fouts are tied for 23rd with 254.

425 - Franchise wins [regular season/postseason combined] after Sunday's win over Atlanta.

556 - With 556 career receptions, Kamara has the most receptions by a running back in his first eight seasons in NFL history. Kamara is also ten receptions from taking over second place in club record books in receiving.

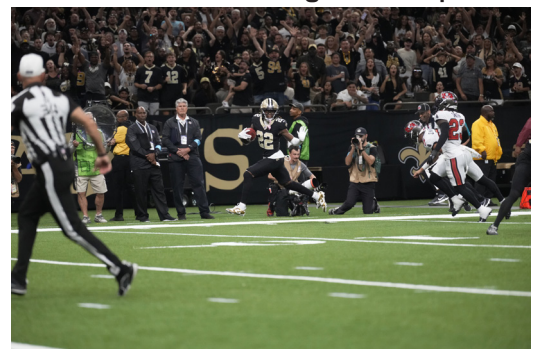

SUPER SPECIAL TEAMS UNITS

In their fifth year under the supervision of **Darren Rizzi**, who was elevated to interim head coach on Monday after supervising special teams since 2019, the Saints special teams units finished 2023 ranked second in the NFL under writer Rick Gosselin’s comprehensive rankings system. This was the fourth top five ranking by the Saints special teams units during Rizzi’s tenure, based on 22 kicking-game categories with New Orleans leading or sharing the lead in five of them and finishing in the top ten in 13.



SPECIAL TEAMS TOUCHDOWNS

In 2023, New Orleans recorded two touchdowns on special teams for the first time since the 2017 campaign. WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed** had a 76-yard punt return for a touchdown at Green Bay on Sept. 24, the team’s first punt return for a touchdown since 2019. On Dec. 10, vs. Carolina, LB **Nephi Sewell** force Panthers P Johnny Hekker to fumble on a punt play, which was recovered by LB **D’Marco Jackson** for an eight-yard touchdown. New Orleans scored their first of 2024 on October 13, when Shaheed returned a punt 54 yards for a score vs. Tampa Bay.

With Rasheed suffering the season-ending knee injury, the punt return duties will now fall to rookie wideout Jermaine Jackson, who was signed as a free agent following the 2024 NFL Draft out of Idaho. COVERAGE CAPTAIN

New Orleans' coverage units in 2024 are again led by special teams co-captain **J.T. Gray**. Signed by the Saints following the 2018 NFL Draft out of Mississippi State, Gray has been voted by his teammates as a special teams captain for the past three seasons and has been selected both as a Pro Bowl starter and *Associated Press* All-Pro. Playing in 91 career games, Gray has career totals of 85 special teams stops, two blocked punts, three fumble recoveries and 13 defensive tackles, 2.5 sacks, one forced fumble and a pass defense. In 2023, he finished with 11 coverage stops to lead the team and tie for 12th in the NFL in 14 contests. Gray's special teams impact was at its best on September 22 vs. Philadelphia, when he blocked a punt in the third quarter against the Eagles, the second of his career.

In 2023, rookie free agent kicker **Blake Grupe** won placekicking duties in a training camp competition and has made significant contributions to the special teams units.

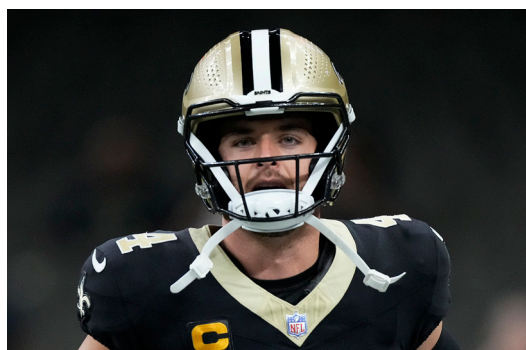
Grupe was signed as a free agent out of Notre Dame, where he played his graduate campaign in 2022, after handling kicking duties at Arkansas State from 2017-21. In 17 games, Grupe made 30 of 37 field goal attempts and all 40 PAT attempts to lead the team with 130 points. QUARTERBACKS

DEREK CARR



On March 6, 2023, the Saints agreed to terms with Derek Carr on a four-year contract to solidify the quarterback position. He spent the first nine seasons of his NFL career with the Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders. Originally selected in the second round [36th overall] of the 2014 NFL Draft by the Raiders out of Fresno State, the Bakersfield, Calif. native has started all 166 career regular season games he has played in, the most starts at the position over that time, completing 3,700-of-5,690 passes [65.0 pct.] for 40,594 yards with 253 touchdown passes, 111 interceptions and a 92.7 passer rating, while adding 924 rushing yards and seven touchdowns. Since entering the league in 2014, Carr ranks first in the NFL in completions, second in passing yardage and sixth in passing touchdowns. He became the third quarterback in NFL history to pass for 3,000-plus yards in each of his first ten seasons, joining Pro Football Hall of Fame signal-caller Peyton Manning and Russell Wilson. He is just the seventh player in NFL history to reach 40,000 passing yards in his first nine seasons and has completed 316 passes of 25+ yards since he entered the league in 2014, third-most in the NFL over that span.

Carr started all 17 games in 2023 and completed 375-of-548 passes [68.4 pct.] for 3,878 yards with 25 touchdowns, eight interceptions and a 97.7 passer rating. He finished his first season in Black and Gold ranked second in the NFL in fourth quarter passer rating [106.9], sixth in completion percentage, seventh in completions and tenth in TD passes and passer rating.

In 2024, Carr has completed 124-of-184 passes [67.4 pct.] for 1,494 yards, 11 touchdowns, only four interceptions and a 102.2 passer rating. He missed his first games as a Saint in Weeks Six-Eight [oblique], but returned to action for the team's Week nine contest at Carolina and is ranked fifth in the NFL in third down passer rating [116.5] and seventh in the NFL in passer rating.

RUNNING BACKS

ALVIN KAMARA

A talented runner and receiver who was selected by the Saints in the third round of the 2017 NFL Draft out of Tennessee, Kamara enjoyed an outstanding rookie campaign. He ranked first on the club and sixth in the NFL in yards from scrimmage (1,554), second on the team in rushing and receiving, carrying 120 times for 728 yards (6.1 avg) with eight TDs and a two-point conversion, catching 81 passes for 826 yards (10.2 avg) with five touchdowns and one kickoff return for a touchdown. Kamara set a club rookie record with 14 total scores, tied for second in the NFL and finished first in the league in yards per carry. Kamara was the first Saints offensive rookie selected to the Pro Bowl since Rueben Mayes (1986), as an AP second team All-Pro (flex), the club's first rookie All-Pro since 1993. He was also named *The Sporting News* NFL Rookie of the Year and AP NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year.

In 111 career regular season games with 80 starts, Kamara has carried 1,482 times for 6,544 yards (4.4 avg.) with 60 touchdowns and has caught 556 passes for 4,640 yards (8.3 avg.) with 24 touchdowns. Kamara is the franchise's all-time leader in rushing yards, rushing touchdowns, total touchdowns (85), total yards from scrimmage (11,184) and all-purpose yardage (11,842).

Kamara is off to a spectacular start in 2024, carrying 167 times for 714 yards (4.3 avg.) with six touchdowns and catching a club-best 51 passes for 421 yards (8.3 avg.) with a career-long 57-yard touchdown. With a nose for the end zone and the chains, he is ranked first in the league in first downs (55), third in total yards from scrimmage (1,136), tied for tenth in total touchdowns, tied for eighth seventh in rushing touchdowns and leads running backs in receiving.

SCRIMMAGE LEADER

Since entering the NFL in 2017, Kamara ranks second in the league in total yards from scrimmage (11,184), only one of two players to have 11,000 over that period. With 1,136 scrimmage yards this season, Kamara is the third player since 2000 with at least 1,1000 scrimmage yards in each of his first eight seasons, joining Matt Forte and Pro Football Hall of Famer LaDainian Tomlinson..

JAMAAL WILLIAMS

This seven-year NFL veteran was signed by the New Orleans Saints as an unrestricted free agent in the 2023 offseason. In eight NFL seasons with Green Bay [2017-20], Detroit [2021-22] and New Orleans [2023-], Williams has played in 111 games with 44 starts, carrying 1,053 times for 4,082 yards with 32 touchdowns, also catching 182 passes for 1,282 yards with eight touchdowns for 5,353 total yards from scrimmage. Williams is part of a formidable rushing trio with Kamara and his former college teammate, Taysom Hill. In 2024, he has spelled Kamara at key times, rushing for 124 yards with one touchdown and catching four passes for 21 yards.

JORDAN MIMS

A former standout at Fresno State, where he rushed for 3,285 yards and 37 TDs, Mims joined the Saints practice squad after going to 2023 training camp with Buffalo and contributed on special teams in two games for the Black and Gold in 2023. 6-0, 205, Mims will contribute in the run game and on special teams after earning a roster spot and had a coverage tackle, Sept. 22, vs. Philadelphia and has rushed for 39 yards and caught four passes for 42 yards.

WIDE RECEIVERS

MARQUEZ VALDES-SCANTLING

A fifth round pick of the Green Bay Packers in 2018 out of South Florida, Valdes Scantling is a seven-year NFL veteran, who has played in 100 career regular season games with 61 starts for the Packers [2018-21], Kansas City Chiefs [2022-23], Buffalo Bills [2024] and Saints [2024-present]. He has posted career totals of 192 receptions for 3,295 yards [17.2 avg.] with 18 touchdowns and with his 6-4, 206-pound frame has the ability to win contested catches and make big plays. Valdes-Scantling’s 17.2 yards per catch average since coming into the NFL in 2018, ranks first in the league.

DEEP THREAT

In his second appearance with New Orleans, since signing two weeks ago, Valdes-Scantling put on one of the most impressive receiving performances of the season on Sunday vs. Atlanta, grabbing three passes for 109 yards [36.3 avg.] with touchdowns of 40 yards and two years, as well as a 67-yard grab. In yards per catch [min. three receptions], Scantling’s 36.3 average was the fourth-highest single game performance in the NFL in 2024.

TIGHT ENDS

TAYSOM HILL

Hill has brought unheralded versatility to the Saints offense and special teams. A participant on special teams since midseason in 2017, as well as a signal-caller and as a runner and receiver, Hill has played in 103 regular season games with 47 starts at several positions. He has carried 425 times for 2,289 yards, the most by a Saint not to play running back full-time, with 30 touchdowns, ranked fifth in club records. In the passing game, he has caught 86 passes for 856 yards with 11 touchdowns, completed 192-of-300 passes (64.2 pct.) for 2,351 yards with 11 touchdowns, returned 19 kickoffs for 447 yards, made one defensive tackle, one forced fumble, 15 special teams tackles and blocked one punt.

Despite missing four games this season with rib injuries, Hill has shown his versatility, carrying 27 times for 130 yards with three touchdowns, catching ten passes for 100 yards and completing one pass for three yards, while contributing on several special teams units.

RENAISSANCE MAN

Hill turned in an all-around standout performance in the November 5, 2023 win over the Chicago Bears, where he led the team in rushing, carrying 11 times for 52 yards (4.7 avg.), completed a three-yard touchdown pass to tight end Juwan Johnson and caught four passes for 13 yards with one touchdown.

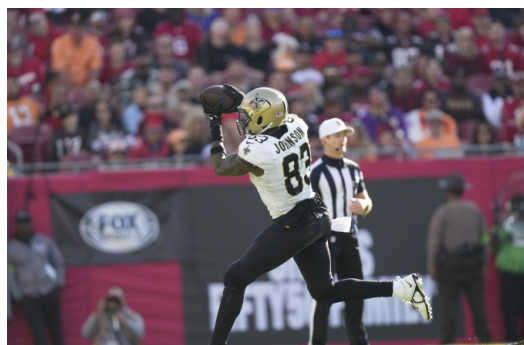
JUWAN JOHNSON

The former Penn State and Oregon wideout joined the New Orleans Saints in 2020 following the NFL Draft and transitioned to tight end his second season in 2021. In 2022, the New Jersey native had a breakout campaign as he appeared in 16 games with 12 starts and finished with 42 receptions for 508 yards and a team-best seven touchdown grabs. Johnson was tied for third among National Football League tight ends in receiving touchdowns. Overall, Johnson’s 15 touchdown grabs since 2021 lead the team.

In 13 games with 11 starts in 2023, Johnson finished with 37 receptions for 368 yards and four touchdowns to lead the position group in all major receiving categories. In his final four contests of the season, three of which were Saints victories, Johnson had 17 grabs for 206 yards and three touchdowns. In 2024, he has 22 grabs for 247 yards.

BIG TARGET

FOSTER MOREAU

This veteran tight end and New Orleans native who was a standout at Jesuit High School and Louisiana State University signed with the Saints in the 2023 offseason. He finished his fifth National Football League season and first with the Black and Gold after spending his first four campaigns with the Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders, who originally selected him in the fourth round of the 2019 NFL Draft. In his career, Moreau has contributed both as a pass catcher and blocker, appearing in 86 regular season games with 54 starts and has recorded 124 receptions for 1,467 yards [11.8 avg.] with 16 touchdowns, also adding seven special teams tackles.

In his first season with the Saints, Moreau was selected as the club’s winner of the Ed Block Courage Award, recognizing his recovery and return to the field following an offseason diagnosis of Nodular Lymphocyte-Pedominant Hodgkins Lymphoma [NLPHL] at a free agency physical with the team. Moreau returned to the field following the NFL Draft and also battled a nagging ankle injury to play in 15 games with ten starts and recorded 21 receptions for 193 yards with one touchdown.

In 2024, Moreau is tied for the team lead with three scoring grabs on 12 catches for 167 yards [13.9 avg.], starting all ten games, providing a presence in both the blocking game and the passing game.



DEFENSIVE LINE

CAMERON JORDAN

New Orleans' first choice in the 2011 NFL Draft [24th overall] out of the University of California, Jordan has played in 219 career regular season games with 218 starts, recording 789 tackles [485 solo], a franchise record 118.5 sacks for a loss of 784.5 yards, three interceptions, 65 pass breakups, 15 forced fumbles and 11 fumble recoveries. In 2023, despite a lingering ankle injury, Jordan started every contest and recorded 43 tackles [20 solo], two sacks, three pass breakups and one fumble recovery.

VERSATILE DEFENDER

Jordan is the only NFL defender to record at least 300 tackles, 60 sacks, 75 stops for loss and 90 quarterbacks hits since 2017. Since 2017, he has posted 397 stops, 72 sacks, 90 tackles for loss and 131 quarterback hits.

ONE OF 15

Jordan is now one of only 15 National Football League players to have at least 15 sacks against two opponents, 17 against the Tampa Bay Buccaneers and 23 against the Atlanta Falcons, both NFC South divisional rivals. Jordan's 23 takedowns of former Atlanta QB Matt Ryan are the most sacks a player has had against an individual quarterback in NFL history.

TACKLES FOR LOSS

Jordan's 89 tackles for loss since 2017 are ranked sixth in the NFL over the period.

PRO BOWL LEADER

With eight Pro Bowl appearances as a Saint since joining the club in 2011, no Saints defensive player has been selected to the league's all-star game more than Jordan in franchise history and only trails QB Drew Brees in all-time selections

IRON MAN

Until missing the Dec. 12, 2021 contest at the New York Jets on the Reserve/COVID-19 list, Jordan had enjoyed the longest active games played streak (172) among position players and the longest games started streak. Missing one contest in 2022 (eye), his first due to injury, Jordan played in at least 16 contests in his first 12 seasons. In 2023, he played in every game for the 12th time in his 14-year career, opening all 17 contests.

In addition to being the franchise's all-time sack leader, Jordan has led the Saints in takedowns a franchise-best nine times (2012-13, 2015-19 and 2021-22).

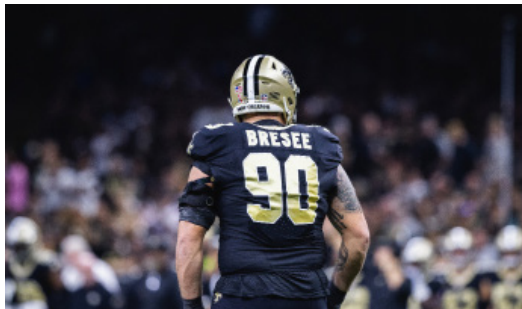

BROWNS VS. SAINTS

BRYAN BRESEE

The team's first round selection in the 2023 NFL Draft out of Clemson after being a three-time All-ACC selection, the Maryland native played in 26 games with 21 starts for the Tigers, producing 54 tackles [35 solo], 15 stops for loss, nine sacks, a forced fumble, an interception and five passes defended.

Bresee immediately found a role in New Orleans' interior rotation and appeared in all 17 games, recording 24 tackles, 4.5 sacks and six pass breakups. His takedown total was the highest by a Saints rookie defensive tackle since becoming an official statistic in 1982 and his pass defense total was the most in club records for a rookie at the position since the statistic was officially recorded in 1980, Bresee also tied for second in the league among defensive tackles in 2023.

Bresee is enjoying a breakout sophomore campaign, playing in all ten games and ranked fifth in the NFL among defensive tackles with four sacks.

CARL GRANDERSON

Signed by New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Wyoming in 2019, Granderson posted 17.5 sacks in college and possesses the prototypical frame for an NFL pass rusher. Granderson has become a significant cog in the team's defensive line rotation with 213 tackles, 26.5 sacks, four pass breakups, four forced fumbles and two recoveries.

Earning the starting right defensive end position in 2023, Granderson posted a career-high 78 tackles [44 solo], led the team with a career-best 8.5 sacks for a 55-yard loss, one pass defense, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery. Through ten games in 2024, Granderson has 34 tackles, 3.5 sacks, ranked third on the team and leading the defensive ends, two passes defended and one forced fumble.

TACKLES UP FRONT

Granderson's 78 tackles in 2023 ranked fifth in the National Football League among defensive linemen and were the most by a Saints defensive lineman since 2004.

PAYTON TURNER

With the 28th overall pick in the 2021 NFL Draft out of Houston, the Saints added to the defensive line with this gifted pass rusher. In 18 career games, Turner has recorded 29 tackles, three sacks, one pass breakup one fumble recovery, one special teams stop and one blocked field goal. In 2023, the Texan suffered a toe injury in the season-opening win over Tennessee that would sideline him for 15 contests. However, Turner returned for the season finale vs. Atlanta and recorded the first fumble recovery of his career, showing his promise both with his pass rush and playmaking abilities. Turner is a part of the team's defensive line rotation in 2024 with 11 tackles, two sacks, two passes defended, one forced fumble and two special teams stops.

LINEBACKERS

CHASE YOUNG

Originally selected by Washington with the second overall pick in the 2020 NFL Draft out of Ohio State, this talented edge rusher is in his fifth season in the NFL and first with New Orleans. In five campaigns for Washington [2020-23], San Francisco [2023] and New Orleans [2024], Young has appeared in 52 regular season games with 32 starts and recorded 118 tackles [78 solo], 18.5 sacks, 24 stops for loss, ten pass breakups, six forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries. The consensus NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year, Young recorded 44 tackles, 7.5 sacks, ten stops for loss and made multiple splash plays with four forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries in 2020. Young played in only 12 games from 2021-22 after suffering a knee injury midway through his second campaign. In 2023, he played in seven games for Washington and nine for San Francisco following a midseason trade and tied his career-best with 7.5 takedowns in helping the 49ers advance to Super Bowl LVIII. Young has fit in with the New Orleans defensive line with 19 tackles, three sacks, a takedown on a two-point conversion attempt, a forced fumble and one pass defense.

NATHAN SHEPHERD

Originally selected by the New York Jets in the third round of the 2018 NFL Draft out of Fort Hays State, this versatile defensive tackle enters his seventh NFL season, his second campaign with the Saints. The Ajax, Ontario, Canada native has appeared in 98 career games with 37 starts, totaling 18- tackles [95 solo] and nine sacks for a loss of 75 yards. In 2024, this valued free agent acquisition has started every game for New Orleans for the second consecutive season and has 25 tackles and a split sack.

KHALEN SAUNDERS

Originally selected by Kansas City in the third round of the 2019 NFL Draft out of Western Illinois, Saunders enters his sixth NFL season and second campaign with New Orleans. Signed as an unrestricted free agent in 2023, Saunders combined with two other newcomers in Shepherd and Bresee to form a new interior front, recording career-highs in tackles [57] and solo stops [24]. In 61 career regular season games with 25 starts, Saunders has recorded 157 tackles [73 solo], 5.5 sacks, one interception, four pass breakups and five stops for loss.



DEMARIO DAVIS

This dependable and sure-tackling defender joined the New Orleans Saints in 2018 after spending his first six NFL seasons with the New York Jets and Cleveland Browns. In his career, the Brandon, Miss. native has appeared in 203 regular season games with 189 starts for the Jets [2012-15, 2017], Browns [2016] and the Saints [2018-], recording 1,401 stops [892 solo], 43.5 sacks, three interceptions, 57 pass breakups, four forced fumbles, eight fumble recoveries and 24 special teams tackles.

In 2023, Davis started every contest and again led the Black and Gold in tackles with 121 stops [74 solo], ranked second with 6.5 sacks and added one forced fumble, one fumble recovery and four pass breakups. He joined LB Joe Federspiel as only the second Saint to have 100 stops in six straight seasons, having done so in his last seven campaigns and his tenth season overall of his 12-year National Football League career.

Through nine games in 2024, Davis has 66 stops [32 solo], one sack and two pass defense, despite missing the first game of his career due an injury, ranking first on the team in stops.

PETE WERNER



New Orleans selected this three-year starter from Ohio State in the second round of the 2021 NFL Draft. The Indianapolis native finished his college career playing in 47 career games with 35 starts, recording 185 tackles [111 solo], 16 stops for loss, four sacks, 11 pass breakups, four forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Werner helped power the Buckeyes to the College Football Playoff championship game as a senior in 2020, when he was voted by the Big Ten coaches as a first-team All-Conference selection and a Butkus Award semi-finalist, posting 54 tackles, 2.5 stops for loss, one sack and two forced fumbles.

In four seasons, Werner has played in 50 games with 42 starts and has recorded 274 tackles [180 solo], a split sack, one interception, five pass breakups, two forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and three special teams stops.

Werner finished the 2023 season ranked second on the team with 93 stops, a split sack, one interception, one pass breakup and two fumble recoveries, tied for the team lead. In seven games started/played in 2024, he has posted 43 tackles and one pass defense.

WILLIE GAY JR.



A contributor on defense for the back-to-back Super Bowl Champion Kansas City Chiefs, this sideline to sideline linebacker joined the Saints at the start of the 2024 free agency period. In five seasons, Gay has played in 66 regular season games with 53 starts, posting 249 tackles [162 solo], six sacks, four interceptions, including one returned for a touchdown, 21 pass breakups, three forced fumbles, six fumble recoveries and eight special teams stops. In nine postseason games played/starts, Gay has accumulated 29 stops, a split sack and three passes defended.

In his final season in Kansas City, Gay played in 16 regular season games with 15 starts for the Chiefs and finished the season with 58 tackles [44 solo], one sack, one interception, four pass breakups, one forced fumble and a career-high three fumble recoveries. In three postseason starts en route to the Super Bowl Championship, Gay collected nine more stops and one pass defense. Despite missing one contest with a hand injury, Gay leads the Saints in 2024 with two fumble recoveries.

ANFERNEE ORJI

After originally signed as an undrafted free agent out of Vanderbilt in 2023, where he led the Commodores in tackles in each of his final three seasons, Orji spent his entire rookie season on the club's practice squad. He received the opportunity to see extensive snaps in practice in training camp due to injuries to teammates Davis and Werner. In three preseason contests, Orji led the team with 20 tackles [team-high 13 solo], one stop for loss, two passes defended and three special teams stops, securing a 53-man roster spot. He ranks second on the team with 12 special teams tackles and has added 15 defensive stops.

SECONDARY

S TYRANN MATHIEU

This versatile, hard-hitting, playmaking safety and New Orleans native enters his third season with his hometown team, signing after the 2022 NFL Draft. Mathieu has brought experience and leadership to the Saints secondary. He was originally selected by the Arizona Cardinals in the third round (69th overall) in the 2013 NFL Draft out of LSU and has played for the Cardinals (2013-17), Houston Texans (2018), Kansas City Chiefs (2019-21) and Saints (2022-). In 11 NFL seasons, he has played in 173 regular season games with 164 starts and has posted career totals of 810 tackles (664 solo), 43 stops for loss, 11 sacks for a loss of 78 yards, 36 interceptions for 530 return yards, four brought back for touchdowns, 105 passes defended, six forced fumbles, eight fumble recoveries and five special teams stops. Mathieu has been selected to three Pro Bowls, three Associated Press All-Pro teams and the Pro Football Hall of Fame’s 2010’s All-Decade Team.

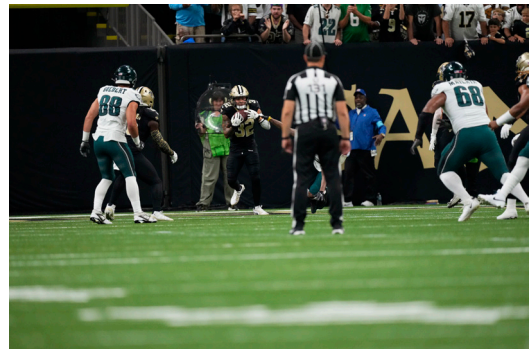
In his second season in New Orleans in 2023, Mathieu opened all 17 contests for the second consecutive campaign and finished with 75 tackles (50 solo), four interceptions, tied for seventh in the NFL and the team lead, returned for 122 yards with a TD and nine passes defended.

THE ONLY ONE

In 2024, Mathieu is his usual playmaking self. Through eight games, he has opened every contest at free safety and posted 38 tackles (30 solo), three interceptions, six pass breakups, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery. Mathieu is tied for eighth in the National Football League with three interceptions and is ranked first on the club with four total takeaways.

FOUR IN A ROW

Dating back to an interception in the 2023 season finale vs. Atlanta, recovering a fumble in the 2024 season opener vs. Carolina and picking off Dallas Cowboys quarterback Dak Prescott and Philadelphia Eagles signal-caller Jalen Hurts in Weeks Three and Four, Mathieu recorded a least one takeaway in four consecutive games for the first time in his career. Mathieu is the first Saints defender to record takeaways in four consecutive contests since safety Sammy Knight had at least one in five consecutive contests from Oct. 7-Nov. 4, 2001.



NOSE FOR THE BALL

Mathieu’s 36 interceptions since coming into the NFL in 2013 are first in the league over the period after tying for the club lead with four picks in 2023 and leading the team with three in 2024. Mathieu’s 36 career picks are the most active players.

BROWNS VS. SAINTS

ALONTAE TAYLOR

Selected by the Saints in the second round (49th overall) of the 2022 NFL Draft out of Tennessee, Taylor shook off early injuries to play in 13 games with nine starts and posted 45 tackles (38 solo) and a club-best 11 pass breakups, ranked fourth among NFL rookies.

Moving to the nickel position in 2023, possessing extensive experience on the inside and the outside, Taylor appeared in all 17 games with 13 starts and recorded 75 tackles, his first two career interceptions and a career-high 14 pass breakups, tied for second on the team and ninth in the NFL.

In 2024, Taylor has played in all ten games with seven starts and ranks third on the team with 57 tackles (42 solo), is tied for first with four sacks and has added ten passes defended and a team-best two forced fumbles. His four sacks are tied for the most by a Saints cornerback with Alex Molden. His pass defense total is tied for fourth in the National Football League

GET A HAND ON

Taylor's ten passes defended are tied for fourth in the NFL, while his 35 since coming into the NFL in 2022 are tied for sixth.

DB DROP

In the Sept. 8 season-opening win over Carolina, Taylor became the first Saints defensive back to record three sacks in a contest since the statistic was officially recognized by the NFL in 1982. The only other defensive back to record three sacks on kickoff weekend is former Chargers S Rodney Harrison (vs. Buffalo, 9/6/98). After splitting a sack on Sunday at the Los Angeles Chargers, Taylor's four sacks are tied for the highest total by a cornerback in Saints record books with Alex Molden's four in 1997, while the total leads all defensive backs.

ATLANTA FALCONS VS. NEW ORLEANS SAINTS SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 10, 2024 • CAESARS SUPERDOME

- The Saints defeated the Atlanta Falcons 20-17 on Sunday, improving their record to 3-7 and their all-time regular season record against the Falcons to 56-55. The win also extended the Saints' current home win streak against Atlanta to three games.
- Interim Head Coach **Darren Rizzi** got a win in his Saints head coaching debut, making him the fifth Saints head coach to win his debut with the club, joining J.D. Roberts (1970), Ernie Hefferle (1975), Sean Payton (2006) and Dennis Allen (2022). Both Roberts' and Hefferle's wins were also as interim head coaches.
- The Saints victory against the Falcons gave the franchise their 425th victory (regular season and postseason combined).
- RB **Alvin Kamara** continued to be a reliable force in the Saints backfield with 17 carries for 55 yards while adding a club-best five receptions for 54 yards receiving. He became the Saints' all-time leading rusher on a seven-yard rush in the first quarter, surpassing his former teammate Mark Ingram II. Kamara now has 6,544 career rushing yards.
- Kamara has 24 career games with at least 50 rushing yards and 50 receiving yards, surpassing Tiki Barber (23 games) and Pro Football Hall of Famer LaDainian Tomlinson (23) for the third-most such games in NFL history. Only Pro Football Hall of Famer Marshall Faulk (41) and Christian McCaffrey (30) have more.
- Kamara has 1,136 scrimmage yards this season and is the third player since 2000 with at least 1,100 scrimmage yards in each of his first eight seasons, joining Matt Forte and Pro Football Hall of Famer LaDainian Tomlinson.
- With his five receptions, he surpassed former Saint Darren Sproles and Matt Forte in the NFL record books and took sole possession of ninth place in all-time running back career receptions (556).
- With his 54 receiving yards on Sunday, Kamara surpassed Earnest Byner and moved into 16th in the NFL record books for receiving yards by a running back.
- Kamara had 109 total yards from scrimmage, his 56th game with 100+ yards from scrimmage, the most in the NFL since he entered the league in 2017.

- Kamara played in his 111th career regular season game and moved into a tie for 37th on the club's all-time list for games played with G/T Andrus Peat.
- QB **Derek Carr** was efficient for New Orleans. He finished 16-of-25 (64.0 pct.) for 269 yards with two touchdown passes, zero interceptions and a 126.9 passer rating. The offensive line kept Carr's jersey clean, not surrendering a sack.
- Carr now has 5,681 career completions, surpassing Pro Football Hall of Fame QB Fran Tarkenton (Class of 1986) to move into sole possession of 20th all-time in NFL history.
- With 227 passing yards, Carr also surpassed Pro Football Hall of Fame QB Joe Montana (Class of 2000) to move into 23rd all-time for career passing yards (40,594).
- With Carr's two touchdown passes, he now has 253 career touchdown passes, surpassing Drew Bledsoe to take sole possession of 26th all-time.
- Carr's two touchdown strikes were to WR **Marquez Valdes-Scantling**, who finished with three receptions for 109 yards (36.3 avg.). He tied a career-high for scoring grabs and also had a game-high 67-yard catch. Carr and Valdes-Scantling connected on 40-yard and two-yard touchdowns, marking the first game where a Saints receiver had multiple touchdown receiving game since WR **A.T. Perry** did so in the 2023 regular season finale against the Falcons.
- WR **Kevin Austin Jr.**, and TE's **Taysom Hill** and **Juwan Johnson** were all efficient with two grabs each. Austin and Hill both had 36 yards apiece and Johnson had 22.
- Hill played in his 103rd career game today, moving into a tie for 53rd on the club's all-time games played list with DL Elex Price and S Malcolm Jenkins.
- The only takeaway from today was a fourth-quarter interception by S **Tyrann Mathieu**. Mathieu now has 36 career interceptions, the most by an active player, surpassing a tied with Vikings S Harrison Smith. Mathieu also tied his career-high with three pass breakups, his most as a Saint.
- LB **Demario Davis** led the defensive effort with 10 total tackles (two solo) and one pass breakup. Davis now has 1,401 career tackles, surpassing the 1,400-tackle mark and now has 40 career pass breakups.
- Davis played in his 107th game as a Saint and moved into a tie for 44th all-time in Saints record books for games played with S Gene Atkins and LB Pat Swilling.
- DB **Ugo Amadi** recorded nine solo tackles, a new career high in solo stops and is tied for a career high in total stops, and also added three stops for a loss, a new career-high.
- DE **Payton Turner** recorded his second career forced fumble on his sack today. His first career forced fumble and his first also came against the Falcons in Week Four.

- DT **John Ridgeway III** blocked a field goal by Atlanta K Younghoe Koo, the first blocked field goal by a Saint since Turner did so in the 2022 season opener against Atlanta.
- DE **Cameron Jordan** recorded his first sack of the season against the Falcons, and with it, he moved into a tie with Pro Football Hall of Fame DE Reggie White (Class of 2006) in sixth in NFL record books for sacks against one opponent with 24 (White – NYG, Jordan – ATL).
- Jordan also played in his 219th career game on Sunday and moved a tie for 20th in games played among NFL defensive linemen with Pro Football Hall of Fame DT John Randle (Class of 2010) and stalwart defensive tackle Jeff Zgonina.
- DT **Nathan Shepherd** and Valdes-Scantling both made their 100th career appearances today. Shepherd finished with two tackles (one solo).
- LB **Pete Werner** played in his 50th career game against the Falcons and finished with five tackles and one pass defense.
- DB **J.T. Gray** and LB **D'Marco Jackson** tied for the team lead with two special teams tackles apiece.
- P **Matthew Hayball** punted five times for 224 yards (44.8 gross avg. and 43.2 net), including four downed inside the 20-yard line.
- K **Blake Grupe** drilled both field goals today, one from 38 yards and another from 26. He also made both of his PAT attempts. Grupe has made 14 straight field goals at home, the longest stretch of his career.
- New Orleans returns to action next Sunday against the Cleveland Browns in the Caesars Superdome. Kickoff is scheduled for 12:00 pm C.T. and the game is regionally televised on FOX (WVUE FOX 8 locally).

We won the football game because all three phases had great weeks of preparation, and we went out and executed. Listen, there’s plenty of stuff we have to get fixed. There are some takeaways. I thought our fans were unbelievable today. You know you always worry, just generally speaking about ‘well the team’s not doing too good’. This city is starving for some wins, and we were hungry. I know they were hungry, and we were hungry to give them one. That was awesome, but think about how that effected the game. We had some offsides penalties down there in the red zone. The crowd was into the game, loud energy. We’re going to get this dome back to where it used to be. That’s the start. I do want to compliment Alvin [Kamara] on the club rushing record. Just like I just said to the team – anytime you use the phrase ‘all-time’, it’s a big deal. I know he’s joked around about feeling old, but he certainly doesn’t look old. He looks like the same guy that was producing all these years. I thought a couple takeaways from the game, I thought Honey Badger (Tyrann Mathieu), his interception at the end of the game is maybe the biggest play of the game. We started to lose some momentum there a little bit, and it’s not a surprise to anybody who’s from this area and has followed his career, that he’s making big plays and big moments in the game. Another point that I thought was a big deal was that we challenged the wide receivers. There are some wide receivers that weren’t even on our roster that were making catches. [Marquez Valdes-] Scantling with two huge plays. I kind of challenged him this week. We were joking, he and I were joking all week about having juice, having energy and practicing great, and it showed up in the game. A guy like Kevin Austin, you don’t even know who Kevin Austin is. There’s a guy who we picked up in training camp and on the practice squad from the UFL and just worked his ass off every day to a point where some of the veteran guys were like, ‘Man, you’ve got to give this guy a chance’. He stepped up. [John] Ridgeway, a guy that wasn’t on our roster initially way back in training camp, he blocks a field goal. Just some really, really good stuff there. I couldn’t be prouder. I just said to the team and to the crew in there, again, I’ve been around a long time, college and NFL, I’ve been around a long time. I’ve never been prouder of a group the way that they handled everything because when things are uncomfortable it’s easy, it’s easy to just say cash it in. No one did that this week.”

On what happened at the end of the game when he ran on the field

“I’m going to tell you exactly what happened. I yelled at Payton Turner with 30 seconds left because he’s celebrating before the game is over, so I screamed at him. He’s spraying water, and I ripped his ass, quite frankly. When the game was over, he wanted to get me back, and he came up to me when I wasn’t looking and jacked me in the back. I have a history of stingers and my left arm went completely numb (laughs). Literally completely numb. I’m sure the video has me like this (gesturing). I’m fine, I’m fine. I sound like the old guy, and that’s what I am. That’s what happened. Literally, he gave me a stinger for lack of a better phrase. I couldn’t feel my arm, so my balance was screwed up. I’m fine. Listen, all the other stingers in my life, at least I saw them coming. I was prepared for them. This one, I wasn’t prepared for. If I’m going to get hurt, holy cow. I was grabbing him like, ‘Payton are you f’ing kidding me?’. I’m like I’m happy too, but holy cow.”

On if he was presented a game ball

“They did. Derek [Carr] made a nice little speech in there, and I got a game ball. I gave a game ball to AK (Alvin Kamara). As I said in there, AK’s game ball is an all-time game ball. My game ball is a first-time game ball, but the entire building is receiving a game ball this week. Everybody. Everybody was phenomenal – support staff, coaching staff, front office, players, equipment guys. I gave the equipment guys more work this week changing the lockers around. Like everybody, never heard a bitch or complain. I never heard anybody. Just everybody from day one completely bought in, so the whole building is receiving a game ball. Derek made a nice little presentation.”

On making Alvin Kamara a team captain

“That was a coach’s decision. That was my decision. I thought Alvin’s presented great leadership all year. I think what he means to this city, what he means to this organization. I think about the way he’s played this year. I just thought how he’s handled the week very well. I just thought it was the right thing to do. Again, I’ve mentioned it’s easy to go on and do your own thing but Alvin Kamara might have been the guy who bought in the most of the whole entire team. When the younger guys and those guys see the leadership of the team, when those guys see that, they follow suit. I just thought it was the right thing to do. He’s been acting like a captain, practicing like a captain and playing like a captain, so why not make him a captain?”

On Demario Davis’ leadership on the defense

“Truth be told, I walked over to talk to the defense. I’m sure I could find the video. I circled back around because Demario had them. I said I’m good. I’m not going to do any better than he’s going to do. He had them goofed up. That’s the uniqueness about this team. We have guys like Demario, guys like Cam (Jordan), guys like Honey Badger guys like Alvin and Derek. I mentioned it during the week, we have a unique blend of young and old. Our younger and more inexperienced guys have some really, really good examples there to follow. Demario is as good of a leader as I’ve ever been around.”

On coaching his first game as the head coach

“Besides the stinger, and my left thumb is still coming back, besides that, it was awesome. Listen, you guys know I’m a pretty open guy. This is how my day started. I get down here to the stadium. I get down here to the (Caesars Superdome), and I go in the head coach’s locker room, which you know I’ve never used before, right? So here I am. I go to the bathroom, and this is how my day started – I clogged the toilet. I’m like this is going to be a crappy day, pun intended. I’m like OK, this is not really a great start to the day. Here we go. I’m not really feeling like a head coach of an NFL team right now. I’m like really? This is really how I’m going to start my day? There are moments in the game where I’m so wrapped up in my routine. There were moments today where I’m almost forgetting, I’m in my routine, and I’m kind of forgetting I’m the head coach a couple of times. All true. I thought our staff did a great job. Phil Galiano and Marwan Maalouf did an awesome job with game management, kind of helping me through it. I thought Klint [Kubiak] and Joe [Woods] called a good game. Listen, there’s plenty of stuff to get corrected, but it’s certainly a little surreal to see how happy the players were in the locker room, the celebration. It was awesome.”

On opening the game aggressively

“Yeah, I thought we had to set the tone early on, and that first drive in my mind, if we were going to get a 4th-and-3 or less over the 50-yard line, we were going for it. Set the tone and set the example. Look, it didn’t work out. We left some points there on the board. I thought at that moment, I think it was 4th-and-2 on the five-yard line, I thought the worst case scenario we didn’t get it. We had them pinned back. We got the ball back in pretty good field position after the punt. It all worked out. No doubt. That’s what my message to the team was. My message to Joe and Klint was, ‘Hey, we’re going to be an aggressive play call’. It didn’t work out in the end. We got the incompleteness with Alvin, but listen, that was a great play call by Klint. I wanted to be aggressive. I didn’t want to just run the ball one more time and punt it back. I wanted to be aggressive. In the beginning through the rest of the game, I was on their tail all the way through.”

On what he has felt from the city

“Like I mentioned earlier, I thought the energy in the building was great. I’m not going to lie, I really didn’t know how it was going to be coming here today. Great crowd, great energy. It’s just (great) to

see the fans (excited) in the beginning of the game and to see them as I was walking off at the end was great. I said earlier in the week, the city should be pissed off; the fans should be pissed off. They know what a winner looks like. They want winning football, and the goal all week was to do that. I'm happy we delivered. Now, like I said to the team, let's see if we can duplicate that week after week, but it's certainly a great start."

On the special teams performance

"Well, Younghoe [Koo] kicked our ass in the last game. He was lights out. I briefly talked to Younghoe before the game. Him and I are from the same area. Actually, our two high schools are rival high schools up in North Jersey, so I've known Younghoe a long time. I was busting his chops a little bit because he was lights out the last time we played him down there in Atlanta. He's a great, great player. Great job by [John] Ridgeway getting his hand on the ball, but certainly when that other ball went up, I thought the voodoo gods in the Superdome were helping us out today and Koo for sure. No doubt we made some big special teams plays. Listen, he's a phenomenal player and he's been really, really consistent the last few years."

On Tyrann Mathieu's role and performance in the game

"I think Joe [Woods] within the game plan wants him to have some things that we do that gives him the ability to read some stuff. Obviously, great read on the interception and great play. That's the best part about him is he's his own biggest critic. He knows what good football is. He knows when he's playing good football, and he knows when he's got to step up and what things he can correct. His experience is huge. He's not a guy I have to worry about getting prepared. He's the ultimate professional. He's got a great football mind. I'm really happy he's in our locker room, that's for sure."

On if he was able to get any sleep last night

"I didn't get a lot during the week, I can promise you. The first few days of the week, I was dragging a little bit. Last night, I made sure. I caught a little bit of a cold during the week. Shocker right? I wasn't eating or sleeping. I caught a little cold here, and I was like man I've got to (deal with it).. I woke up feeling great, ready to go. I came down here refreshed and energized. Now I have to rehab my shoulder because of Payton (Turner)."

On Derek Carr's deep throws today

"He threw a couple of great deep balls today to Scantling. Some great routes by Scantling. It was great to see those guys connect. You look at Derek for the day, he came out of the game with a 127 passer rating, a really efficient game by him. The deep shots are huge because it opens up everything else. Scantling did great because like I said, we put in a couple of those plays, a couple of shots to him, and it was great to see him cash in on those."

On if his family was here

"I did. I didn't have everyone. My two sons that play college football, they weren't able to make it down. I had some family, friends, some of my college buddies came in. Obviously, my family was here. Just a lot of great people, The support this week has been phenomenal. I still haven't answered every text. I'm still working on that, but it's been awesome."

QB DEREK CARR

Opening statement

"Many people didn't know this, but my dad was dealing with some stuff this week. So shoutout to my dad, that one was for you. He's doing good."

On impact of this win

"Hopefully (this) just gives us confidence in our process and give us confidence in the way that we go about our business. When things don't go right, when a coach gets fired, everyone feels that because we all had a hand in that. It's football, it's not just one person. But we know how that goes. It was an emotional week, but I was proud of our guys that we flipped the switch and compartmentalized and just went to work. Thankful to get a win against the team leading our division. What a difference a week makes for us, so hopefully we can continue to build on it. We'll definitely have some corrections, but to get this win, I know it felt good for everybody in the building, and gave us, hopefully, some confidence going forward."

On throwing to Marquez Valdes-Scantling

"I told [Marquez], I said I love throwing to fast people, my whole career. I said, 'You're fast and tall,' so that's two good things. We didn't have a lot of experience with him playing receiver for us today, but at the end of the day, nobody cares. We have to execute. We have to go make plays. Thankfully we have a guy like MVS, that has played a lot of football at a very high level in some big situations, so he was able to come down with some of those plays for us. But it felt good to be able to hit and connect on some of those, because we knew the potential was there, but it's nice to connect on and see it actually happen."

On reaction to successful connections with a new teammate

"I'm just thankful. I'm thankful they hit. Throw to those fast guys, I tend to just see where they're running. Coach (Greg) Olson always told me to judge angles and speeds, whether it's walk through or full speed, and that's how you work on accuracy. But thankfully, we were able to hit them in stride. That's the thing about those plays, if you don't hit them people say, 'Oh, well they haven't worked together,' and it'd probably be true. But thankfully, we hit them and they ended up being really big plays for us in this game. But he's a veteran, I'm a veteran. He knew the landmarks, he knew where to run, and thankfully I've thrown to some fast guys here before that helped me."

On dealing with the missing speed with injured players (Chris Olave and Rashid Shaheed)

"I think [Marquez] gives us an element of that, especially now. Making those plays down the field is not easy. Tracking the ball with guys all over you, that's not easy, but he did a great job. Hopefully that adds an element to the team when watching the film, like 'Oh, wow. They're back to throwing things 60 yards in the air.' Hopefully that helps everyone else, helps [Alvin Kamara]. It all works together. I'm sure the happiest person in the building was Alvin when he saw those connect, because now safeties got to back up, DBs are a little less downhill. That's football, it all works together."

On Alvin's dropped pass on the last drive

"Me and Klint [Kubiak], on the sideline, he said, 'Hey, next two to five, how do you like this?' and I was like, 'Yes, please call that one.' So we liked it, and there's a progression to it. It just ended up being Alvin's play. I mean, it's AK, I'm not worried about it. Obviously we want to hit it, we want to hit them all, but we're going to keep continuing to rely on 41. He makes that play more times than not. He basically came over and just fell on me like, 'I'm so sorry.' I just put my arm around him like, 'Bro, I love you, bro. If that ends up costing us, I would throw it a hundred more times to you.' He knows that, I know that. I

mean, he was heartbroken when that happened. He wanted to ice the game, not even have to put the defense out there in that situation, but thankfully the defense made a stop, so it didn't hurt as much."

On recovering from a play like that

"[Darren] Rizzi talked a lot about this week like, 'Hey, if crap doesn't go our way, it's okay. Keep playing.' It kind of just eased the mood. Honestly, we have nothing to lose. They already fired our coach, We lost last week, at the time, to a team that was in last place in our division. What else do we have to lose? Just go out there and compete. If it doesn't go right, keep playing. That mindset of keep playing, keep competing just put ease to everybody. When you get your back up against the wall and you get guys in that situation or scenario, it can kind of feel like a big letdown. It happened, and everyone's crushed, like 'Oh, man, I wish we had that one,' but if they go get a field goal, we just keep playing. So I definitely felt that steadiness for sure."

On Coach Rizzi's attitude leading into today

"Fired up, honest, intense. Those are the words when I think of Rizz, that's what I think of, especially pregame. His awareness for what everyone's dealing with, too, it's rare, but he's really good at it. Rich Bisaccia is a lot like that. Their awareness, I don't know if it's just special teams guys or what, but their awareness for knowing what a guy's dealing with, knowing what's going on at home, but still encouraging you, there for you. He texted me last night about the situation that we were dealing with, with the family, and for that to be on his mind when he's about to coach his first game as a head coach, it just says a lot about him. And I'm sure he texted multiple people last night, because that's just who he is. We love playing for him, and you want to win for him. You want to put your best foot forward and hopefully give him a chance at being a head coach someday."

On the current state of the locker room

"Just confident, really. We really believed that we were a good football team this whole time. And I know, trust me, for me especially, that that was a long seven weeks. I was like, is this ever going to end? We have those human thoughts, but we never wavered in the work and we never wavered in our confidence in what we could be. Just when you get punched in the face over and over again, it starts to hurt. So for us to bounce back and do that, Double D [Demario Davis] said it to me, he said before the game, 'Don't be surprised when it goes well today,' and I just smiled because that's how we felt the whole time. He said, 'We should be surprised when it doesn't.' That just speaks to the kind of leader that he is, that he's been here for years."

On finding success with an interim coach previously with Raiders in 2021

"Absolutely, and I said that after we met with Rizz when everything first happened. I have seen this, like I sadly joke with y'all, (about this) situation too many times. With this scenario it's very similar where it just feels different. Whatever was going on, it just didn't work out for us. The next guy, when I see it's successful, it just feels different. And Rizz did a great job of changing the environment and just how it felt. To really just give guys hope again, like, 'Hey, we got this,' that kind of feeling. Rizz reminds me a lot of the situation with Rich, and Rich Bisaccia is one of my favorite men in the world, and he's one of my favorite coaches I've ever had. I can't put Rizz there yet, we're one game in, but I do love playing for him."

On whether it was his first time outrushing Taysom Hill

"Thank you for asking that question (laughter). It is the first time I've outrushed Taysom [Hill]. So I think all the quarterback powers would clearly go to me from now on, so we'll see."

RB ALVIN KAMARA

Opening statement

"Before anybody says anything, I just embarrassed everybody. I'm sorry for dropping the ball (on the last possession). Alright, let's go."

On being named a team captain

"(Darren) Rizzi just kind of told me, he was like, 'Yo, I'm naming you captain. It's overdue.' So, when he told me that, (I) obviously appreciate it, and then he announced it in the team meeting, and everybody was hyped. I don't know, I'm the captain."

On reaction after the drop

“I’m good, I was just mad that I put [the defense] back on the field, really. I wasn’t concerned with them going back out and doing what they had to do. I just wish I would’ve just iced it so we could ride off into the sunset.”

On becoming the franchise leader in rushing yards

“It means a lot. I was just telling everybody Rizzi gave me the game ball and just kind of announced that in the locker room. I just told everybody ‘I’m not really one to celebrate too many of my successes. I just keep moving, keep moving, keep moving, keep moving, keep my head down. But this one is special.’ It made me feel old. It made me realize how much ball I’ve played and how many people had a hand in helping me get here. So I’m definitely appreciative to my teammates, to this city, especially to be able to do it in New Orleans, do it in one city. It’s amazing, so I’m going to cherish that.”

On fan recognition moment during the game

“You just put everything into perspective. It just makes me think about everything that I’ve been through to get to this point. Eight years of being here, and all the people that helped me. It’s special.”

On the differences this week with the coaching change

“It was a culmination of a lot of things. It was energy, it was our belief. I think we got some swag back. The preparation, details, the fundamentals. I think everybody was accountable to each other. We haven’t had that. It hasn’t been there. I’ve been saying this past couple weeks, we all want to win. The recipe was just missing something, and I feel like we got that thing. Rizzi came in and he had a clear message for us. He told us, ‘This is what we have to do to win,’ and he gave us the recipe, gave us the formula. Everybody bought in throughout the week. Everybody did what they had to do. It’s about doing your job. And there’s still a lot of things we left out on the field and we’ve got to clean up. And it starts with me and that drop that I’m mad about still, but we won. I think everybody just bought in and we were united. Unity was one of the words of the week. When you’re united, and you all believe, and you’re all together, man, there’s so much you can do. You see it out there and you see the product.”

On how the team “got their swag back”

“We just believed. I think we’ve been lacking in belief. I think we’ve been going out there and playing, and things go well, and right when something goes bad, the faith or the belief just falls out the bottom. But today, everybody was just bought in all the way for four quarters, and that’s what I’m used to, being here, playing a four-quarter game. I think we finished today. We were able to go out there and finish and everybody stayed together. Nobody panicked. It just felt good.”

On Coach Rizzi’s pregame speech

“He was fired up. Accountability, unity, our preparation, it went all the way up when he started speaking. He said, ‘Now you just go up there and do fundamentals, and go out there and have fun and fly around.’ I think everybody soaked that message up, and we went out there and handled business.”

On Coach Rizzi getting fired up on the sideline

“I feel like when you say ‘animated,’ sometimes it’s not genuine. That’s how Rizzi is all the time. He’s always like that. You can expect that energy from him on the sideline. The crazy thing is, with Rizzi becoming the head coach, sometimes you think like, ‘Well, what’s going to change, what’s going to be different.’ Man, Rizzi is the same as he was last week, this week. He’s just got more of a voice now. I think everything that he’s been thinking about, everything that he’s been preparing for, coaching his whole however many years, 30 years, however long he’s been coaching, I think he’s been preparing for this. So, it all just came out today. He did what he had to do. I’m proud of him, his first win as a head coach.”

On response from Mark Ingram after beating rushing record

“I haven’t even checked my phone. I heard from him last week, and he told me I should’ve broke it last week, but that it would be more special at home. But I’m going to talk to him when I get done with this.”

On whether breaking the rushing record was more special at home

“Yeah, of course. Mark [Ingram] told me, because I didn’t even know, ‘You got 12 more yards (to go), you should’ve broken it,’ and I’m like, ‘What?’ And he told me what it was and was like, ‘Man, you could

do it at home, it'll be cool.' So, yeah, it was definitely more special here in front of Who Dat Nation. What better way to do it?"

On whether it was more special against Atlanta

"Yeah, a little bit. That's the hometown, so it is a little special. I think that was special."

On whether this week was different being named captain and chasing record

"No. Business is business. I just knew I had a record to break, but I mean I was just going into the game like any other game. Like I want to win, do whatever I've got to do to help the team."

S TYRANN MATHIEU

On if there have been any changes to his role and approach after the coaching change

"No, pretty much the same old, which I enjoy doing. It's a good defense, a good scheme. Every now and then you itch to make more than just tackles. You'd like to touch the football every now and then. On that play I was able to get to it, that was it."

On what he saw prior to his interception

"It was in a double stack look, so I knew it wasn't anything vertical outside of the digs. It wasn't going to be anything deep in the dig route. So I kind of just set and once I read the route, I just tried to get to the catch point before he did."

On almost getting an interception in the first half

"Correct, correct. I think if it was just a little bit higher, I might've caught that one too."

On if he felt different today

"I think, just watching the season, obviously I haven't touched the football a whole lot in this losing streak. Just going back through the catalog, when we played those guys that first game, it was a lot of digs, a lot of digs. And I think Kirk Cousins, too, he's comfortable throwing that route when he needs a play. That was just one of those situations where I was in the right place at the right time."

On approach to tackling Atlanta's running backs

"I thought that there were few plays that could've been a little better, a little tighter, but for the most part, everybody was dialed in. We pretty much knew what we were going to get all game from those guys. They love running the stretch, they love running the toss. We knew we would have to set the edge and everybody else on the inside has got to run ahead."

On the relief of win after two months of losses

"It's tough, man. Obviously we put our all into this. You never sign up to lose seven games in a row, and sometimes it happens. I think mostly I'm just proud of really our team and everybody in our building. Even (Darren) Rizzi, I thought his whole approach to this week, I thought he really set the table, set the tempo. We really didn't feel like we were at a disadvantage. I think that, collectively, we all went into this game thinking, 'This is about to be one of those games where we have a good time and we win.' That was really the preparation throughout the whole week, just trying to find a way to win."

On Coach Rizzi's pregame approach

"Rizzi was actually calm, cool and collected before the game. Obviously during the game there's a lot of highs and lows, and Rizzi is usually on the high side. Yeah, man, it's fun. Obviously, playing for a coach like that, that can kind of keep your attention, keep you focused on what's ahead, I think that's a big deal."

On previous statements that he hasn't felt like himself

"Honestly, this is a new scheme. This is a new system for me. I've never played in the post, so there's certain angles and different things. Obviously, I put in a lot of work so I feel comfortable doing it, but every now and then I like to be myself. I think anytime I touch the ball I feel more like myself, for sure."

On Alvin Kamara's dropped pass on the final possession

"That's kind been our season. Rizzi coming in throughout the week and challenging us, like, something bad is going to happen, something's not going to go our way. I'd probably say, if that was three or four weeks ago, I don't think we would have got that stop at the end of the game. I think that's a little growth from us collectively. Obviously Alvin has made so many plays in this league, and it's kind of hard to kick him when he drops one. It's really on to the next play."

On what was different today versus during losing streak

"I think Demario [Davis] does a great job of really keeping us centered and keeping us focused on the task at hand. I think in the past, we were pressed to make a play, and if somebody gets out a gap, we miss a tackle, we don't really zone up the read the right way. I think collectively we were all on the same page. But obviously we could be better, I could be better, Alontae [Taylor] could be better, but I thought we stuck in there throughout the whole game. Obviously that's not something that we've done really well in this losing streak."

Opening Statement

“We had all the chances in the world out there and couldn’t capitalize. It was one of those days, one of those moments...I was really ecstatic about the fight for those guys to put themselves in position to win that game even though it wasn’t (our best performance). We are going to play in a bunch of those types of games. We need to plan to play in a bunch of those types of games, particularly against this type of team and the guys that they are and this type of rivalry that we have with these guys.”

On if he considered attempting a field goal at the end of the game

“We would have if we needed to. Obviously, you don’t ever count on that sack, being the big loss that it was. Obviously, right there I would have taken my shot. Obviously, it would’ve been fourth down. We would have had an opportunity for Younghoe (Koo) to kick it and have a walk off kick redemption. That didn’t come to fruition. Obviously, (with) the big sack and fumble and the ball gets way back there. Now, you are kind of in desperation mode, and it didn’t work out.”

On his confidence in Younghoe Koo moving forward

“Like I just said in the locker room, I have all of the confidence in the world in Younghoe. He is one of the best kickers in the game. He’s done it for us a long time. He had an off day. That happens a bunch of times. Shooters shoot. He went out there today and took a shot, and didn’t make it.”

On his message to the offense after it didn’t produce in key moments

“It’s not individualized messages. It is team ball for all of us. So, when we get stops, we want to go out there and (play) complementary ball and be able to score. If we can’t score, we kick field goals. We want to maximize our ability to be great; and, we were not able to do that today. The offense moved the ball down the field a couple of times out there, and we didn’t get field goals. We missed those field goals or had them blocked. We had a chance to go out there on defense and play really well in the second half, but we gave up too many big plays in the first half. So, it’s all across the board. We will have to review the tape. It’s not really a messaging in any particular moment. It is how you get better as a football team.”

On if Marquez Valdes-Scantling's short tenure with the Saints and success against his team today contributed to the defensive struggles

"Obviously, we had to make an adjustment and move A.J. (Terrell) over there. He's one of our best corners in the room and we had to put him on him in the second half. We had to go limit his production. I believe that he had 100 yards in the first half. He had a couple of big plays. He made some big-time plays. We won't make any excuses for anybody. Whoever is on him, we have to go make those plays. We had to make those adjustments in the second half. We had to make them even before halftime."

On how he compartmentalizes giving up two big plays to the Saints compared to the production the rest of the game

"You don't. Hats off to the Saints. They did a great job executing. That's what the game of football is. You go out there and make some plays. They made them. We've got to go out there and find a way to stop those plays and be ahead of the curb so those plays don't happen. They can be disastrous within the framework of the game. I'm fine about my guys staying in the fight. I'm fine about what we did. I'm fine about the adjustments. I'm fine about our guys going out there and playing the right way and doing it the right way. We just need to finish that game off and we would be a lot happier right now."

On critical penalties near the goal line and if he addressed those post-game

"We did. There is always going to be some of those that we talk about that we have to get better at. The holding penalties that you get that you kind of agree with or disagree with don't really matter. They called it. It was first and 20, and then we got a delay of game there. That is on me and the coaching staff. We have to get right on those things. We have to be ready to change all of those things and be ready to be better, no doubt about it."

QB KIRK COUSINS

Opening Statement

"I felt like we had chances to win the football game or at least take the lead late in the game. Not being able to do it is difficult. It's a bad taste in our mouth. This is one that you get sick over. I felt like the second third down of the game, I didn't connect with Drake (London) on that one. We had a chance there to convert and get into scoring range. It would have helped to start fast. To punt there was very frustrating. It was just inches on being a big conversion for us. Throughout the game plays like that showed up. That's pro football. That's the thing about this league. You can get beat when you make a mistake or don't play at your highest level. It can be the difference in winning or losing. You kind of play with the focus and awareness of every snap. Today coming out of the game we feel that because of how many plays that carried that feel."

On plays in the fourth quarter that could have been executed better

"It's all running all together tight now. I'm having a hard time on being able to give you a good answer. On the flight home, I will definitely be watching it. There was a third down (throw down) the pike to Ray-Ray (McCloud III) that I would have loved to have connected on. The check down on the one before to Bijan (Robinson) I would have loved to have connected on to give us a more manageable third down. The interception was a play where I was being too aggressive. I would have loved to have just been more patient and take Kyle Pitts underneath or progressed to Ray-Ray. I did stay patient all game long and then there was the one where I was too aggressive. The final drive we certainly ran out of clock there. The sack didn't help. The sack fumble I would have loved to have just stayed positive there and avoid the negative play we had to overcome. It was tough."

On Raheem Morris putting a positive spin on the loss

"I think it is a good way to approach it. I have learned that not much is going to get coach. He stays very level and very positive. I do internalize and it hurts. It hurts for him too. We are going to have the process of watching it and talking through it with teammates and coaches and fixing things. We'll get back on the horse and get to work again. Losses like this are always tough."

(On speaking to Younghoe Koo) "It's pro football. I don't feel great leaving it in the field goal team's hands. I think it is important that we stay on the field, convert third downs, score touchdowns in the red zone and avoid penalties that back us up in the red zone. We need to execute down there so that we are scoring touchdowns. I always felt that when you kick field goals you tend to lose and when you score touchdowns you tend to win. That's important and where I stick my focus."

RB BIJAN ROBINSON

On today's game

"It was obviously one that we wanted, but we made too many mental mistakes. I wish we had some drives that we could have gotten back. It was definitely a game that we were looking for a win."

On the offense getting off to a slow start

"It was getting loud, so we were going silent. There was some miscommunication that we were going through. That can't be a problem at all. We've got to work more on situations like that. We can't let that be on an excuse. At the end of the day, we need to be on the field as long as we can to help our defense. We need to get back to the pass game and the ground game and get in the end zone."

On his 37 yard touchdown run

“I was following those seven guys up front. For me, it was a run that I had to stay patient on. At first it clogged up and it looked like I didn’t have anywhere to go. At the end of the play at the last second it opened up. I had to break one tackle and then attack the sidelines and get into the end zone. Those are just one of the runs that we work on. I trust the offensive line.”

On how heavy Tyrann Mathieu feels on his back

“I didn’t know that was him. I thought someone was behind me. It looked like they were struggling to get me down. I was like I am going to get into the end zone.”

On if it felt like the Seattle game with the slow start

“It was obviously a different situation, but it was similar to that. Starting slow doesn’t help. Obviously if you start slow, then that doesn’t mean that you are going to lose. It’s definitely harder in the NFL to come back from those slow starts. In practice we harp on going fast, speeding up and getting the ball down the field as fast as we can. It’s the main thing that we try to focus on. They made some good plays on defense. We have to watch it, learn from it and bounce back.”

CB A.J. TERRELL JR.

On if the first half felt like a regression

“We just started slow. It’s something we pride ourselves all week. They had a new coach. We just have to start fast. We gave up a lot of stuff early running the ball and passing the ball. We locked in a little too late coming into the second half.”

On Marquez Valdes-Scantling

“He is an NFL receiver. You can’t sleep on anybody. He had a good first half where we had to make some adjustments.”

On the adjustments the defense made to minimize Valdes-Scantling

“The second half adjustment was for me to start following him. That was the adjustment.”

On dealing with the Saints after Dennis Allen’s firing

“That’s the thing I was saying. You can’t take anyone for granted especially when they have a coaching switch like that. Typically, teams like to come out hot. They actually get more energy when they get a new coach. We mentioned that all week. We knew they were going to come out hot and throw everything at us. We just started out slow. We just can’t beat ourselves and get on task quick.”

On Raheem Morris’s message after the game

“It was super positive. It’s the next game. We left stuff out there that we wish we had back in the first half. We got in our rhythm the second half, but it was a little too late.”

On his assessment of the game

“It’s not the standard that I have for myself. This game is on me and I’ll take that. It’s not ok. I think we played well enough to win the football game especially this one. I let the team down and I don’t take that lightly. It’s one of the lowest points as a kicker. I’ll have to reign myself in over the next couple of days and make the most out of it.”

On the last missed kick

“I made a couple of adjustments after the first miss. I felt pretty good about it when it came off my foot. My reaction was that it came off the foot and it felt good. Sometimes it just doesn’t go that way.”

On a career-long field goal earlier in the year to beat the Saints

“You try not to ride that. It doesn’t really matter what you have done in the past. The next best kick has to be the next one. I just have to move on.”

On what the coaches and players said to him

“They are super supportive. I can’t ask for anything more than that. I am very appreciative of that. At the end of the day I have to be better and I will do better.”

On the first missed field goal

“It felt ok. I just didn’t hit it good enough. I have to play the line better, stick to my process and hit a better ball.”
