**THE MATCHUP**

The 109th regular season matchup between the New Orleans Saints (8-8) and the Atlanta Falcons (7-9) on Sunday, January 7 at the Caesars Superdome, to be played at 12:00 p.m. will be of utmost importance to the postseason hopes of both teams. A New Orleans victory over Atlanta combined with a Tampa Bay Buccaneers loss/tie at the Carolina Panthers would earn New Orleans their first division title since 2020. Even if Tampa Bay wins, a Saints victory and loss/tie by both the Seattle Seahawks and Green Bay Packers would catapult New Orleans into a Wild Card playoff spot and set up a road matchup in Super Wild Card weekend.

Following a three-game losing streak in the middle of the season starting with a 27-17 loss at Minnesota on November 12 through a 33-28 loss to Detroit on December 3, New Orleans started their journey back to contention for their first playoff berth in three years with a 28-6 victory over the Carolina Panthers on December 10 and have won three of the last four contests to even their record at 8-8.

The formula for New Orleans' improved play has varied little over the last four contests since the Saints did not surrender a touchdown in the first two of the four contests. The defense and special teams have forced six takeaways, while the offense has turned the ball over only twice. The New Orleans defense has surrendered only five

touchdowns and 13.8 points per game in their last four contests, both the league's lowest total.

Individually, several players have contributed to the winning cause in all three phases in the last four games. Quarterback **Derek Carr** has completed 92-of-126 passes (NFL-best 73.0 pct.) for 853 yards with ten touchdowns, only two interceptions and a 111.0 passer rating, third in the league. In Sunday's win at Tampa Bay, Carr was an efficient 24-of-32 for 197 yards with two touchdown passes, zero interceptions and a 111.1 passer rating. Tight end **Juwan Johnson** has caught 16 passes for 186 yards with three touchdown grabs, tied for third in the NFL at the position over the last four contests. He enjoyed a career performance on Sunday with a career-high six receptions for a career-best 90 yards with one touchdown.

On defense, Linebacker **Demario Davis** has made 29 tackles, 2.5 sacks, one pass defense and a fumble recovery during the four-game run. The picked up fumble happened in Sunday's crucial division matchup and led to a field goal, one of four Saints takeaways on the afternoon. Defensive end **Carl Granderson** has made 17 tackles and three sacks in the four-contest stretch, to add to his team leading and career-high season total of 8.5 takedowns.

Field-position changing plays have been made on special teams by defensive back **J.T. Gray**, linebacker **D'Marco Jackson** and linebacker **Nephi Sewell**.

THE COACHES

Dennis Allen was hired as the 17th head coach in New Orleans Saints history on February 8, 2022. Now in his 28th year coaching and 21st in the NFL, Allen has spent 13 seasons in New Orleans in two separate stints, including the six-and-a-half campaigns (2015-21) as the team's defensive coordinator prior to being promoted to head coach. He succeeded Sean Payton, who coached the team for 16 seasons, including the 2009 campaign, when Allen was secondary coach and ended with the Super Bowl XLIV championship. When Allen took control of a Black and Gold defense in Week 11 of the 2015 season that was ranked 32nd both in opponent net yards per game and opponent points per game, he methodically molded a unit that has finished in the top 10 in both categories each of the last three years.

In his first year as head coach of the Saints, Allen guided New Orleans through the challenge of significant injuries at several positions to win three of their last four games after a Week 14 bye and give up 20 or fewer points in the final eight contests of the season, ten points apiece in the final three.

Carrying over to the 2023 season, Allen has helped the Saints establish complementary play on offense, defense and special teams, having New Orleans currently tied for first place in the NFC South heading into Sunday's pivotal division matchup to close out the regular season against the Atlanta Falcons.

Before rejoining the Saints coaching staff in 2015, Allen served as head coach of the Oakland Raiders from 2012-14 and as defensive coordinator of the Denver Broncos in 2011. Prior to his first stint in New Orleans from 2006-10, where he served as assistant defensive line coach from 2006-07 and as secondary coach from 2008-10, Allen was also an assistant with the Atlanta Falcons from 2002-05, where he received his NFL coaching start.

Over the course of his coaching career in New Orleans, Allen has coached LB Demario Davis and DE Cameron Jordan to career seasons. Davis has led the team in tackles in every campaign since signing with the club as an unrestricted free agent in 2018 and has garnered AP All-Pro honors four straight times. Since Allen returned to New Orleans in 2015, Jordan's 88.5 sacks rank third in the NFL.

Allen played safety at Texas A&M from 1992-95, where he started the final 21 games of his college career before being signed as an undrafted free agent by the Buffalo Bills in 1996. Prior to entering the National Football League coaching ranks in 2002, Allen served as a graduate assistant at his alma mater from 1996-99 and as secondary coach at the University of Tulsa from 2000-2001. He

earned a bachelor of business administration degree and a master's in kinesiology from Texas A&M.

Raised in Hurst, Texas, Allen and his wife, Alisson, have a daughter, Layla and a son, Garrison.

Arthur Smith was named the 18th head coach in Atlanta Falcons history on January 15, 2021 after serving as the Tennessee Titans offensive coordinator from 2019-20. In 2021, Smith helped the Falcons improve from a 4-12 record in 2020 to 7-10 marks in 2021 and 2022 and has Atlanta tied for second place in the NFC South in 2023.

Smith orchestrated one of the NFL's top offenses with the Titans from 2019-20, leading the league in red-zone touchdown percentage (75.2), ranking fifth in points per game (27.9) and total offense (379.6). He oversaw the NFL's second-ranked rushing attack, averaging 153.5 yards per game on the ground. The Titans were among the league's best in the red zone. The club's 75.6 (2019) and 75.0 (2020) red zone touchdown percentages are the fourth and fifth-best single-season marks by a team since 2000.

In 2020, Smith's offense averaged 30.7 points per game and 491 total points, good for fourth in the NFL and the second-highest marks in team history. He also oversaw one of the most potent rushing attacks in league history as Derrick Henry became just the eighth player in NFL history to rush for more than 2,000 yards in a single season. Henry's 2,027 rushing yards rank fifth all-time and paced the Titans to the league's second-best rushing offense in 2020. Tennessee's 168.1 yards per game on the ground set a club record and Henry eclipsed Chris Johnson's franchise record of 2,006 rushing yards set in 2009.

Smith served under four different Titans head coaches, working his way up from his 2011 position of defensive assistant/quality control coach. He also spent time as an offensive assistant/quality control coach (2012), offensive line/tight ends asst. (2013), and assistant tight ends coach (2014-15) before taking over as tight ends coach during the 2015 season and holding the position through 2018.

Prior to joining the Titans, Smith spent two years as the defensive quality control coach for the Washington Commanders from 2007-08 serving on legendary coach Joe Gibbs' staff. In addition to his coaching role, he also worked as a college scouting assistant in Washington in 2007. In 2010, Smith worked at the University of Mississippi as an administrative assistant/defensive intern, primarily working with the linebackers.

Smith graduated from North Carolina where he played offensive line and later joined the coaching staff as a graduate assistant (2006), working with the offensive line.

Born and raised in Memphis, Tenn., he went to high school at Georgetown Prep. Smith and his wife, Allison, have two sons, Tanner and Liam, and one daughter, Sophie.

SERIES HISTORY

The Saints-Falcons regular season series is tied 54-54, with New Orleans holding a 24-11 advantage over the Falcons since 2006. Since 1991, 36 games have been decided by eight points or less. The Falcons had a 10-game winning streak from 1995-99, which remains the Saints' longest winless streak against an opponent. New Orleans took 13-of-16 in the rivalry from 1986-94 and Atlanta won nine-straight over the fledgling Saints from 1969-73. Atlanta's most recent mastery over a five-year period ended with a 21-19 win for New Orleans at the Georgia Dome on Nov. 22, 2000. Eight games in the series have gone into overtime.

In the 107 regular season games of the series there has been:

- 2,296 points scored by New Orleans, 2,394 allowed.
- A ten-game Atlanta winning streak from 1995-99.
- A six-game win streak for New Orleans from 1986-89.
- 45 games decided by double-digits.
- 17 games decided by 21 or more points.
- 54 games decided by seven points or less.
- 4 games decided by one point.
- A 38-point win by Saints (11/1/87) - Biggest Saints win.
- A 55-point loss by Saints (9/16/73) - Biggest Saints loss.

- Four shutouts - Two by each club, the most recent a 38-0 win in Atlanta on 11/1/87.
- Eight overtime games— four wins by each club.
- Six Monday night games, two Sunday night games and eight Thursday night games, including Thanksgiving night in 2018 and 2019.

He was a five-time *Associated Press* All-Pro selection and was selected to six consecutive Pro Bowls from 2009-14. A 2010's selection to the All-Decade team, Evan's four first-team All-Pro selections are double that of any other player in Saints history.

Passing Game Coordinator/Quarterbacks Coach **Ronald Curry** - A seventh round draft pick (235th overall) of the Oakland Raiders in 2002 out of the University of North Carolina and played wide receiver for Oakland from 2002-08, appearing in 76 games with 32 starts, registering 193 receptions for 2,347 yards with 13 touchdowns.

Assistant Offensive Line Coach **Kevin Carberry** - Prior to entering the coaching ranks, Carberry competed in training camps of the Cleveland Browns (2005) and Carolina Panthers (2006) and spent the 2005 season on the Detroit Lions practice squad. He also played for the Berlin Thunder of NFL Europe in the spring of 2006. From 2007-08, Carberry played in the Arena Football League for the New York Dragons and Philadelphia Soul and was a member of the Soul's 2008 Arena Bowl Championship squad, starting his coaching career at Chicago high schools in the off-seasons.

Offensive Assistant **Jahri Evans** - Evans was selected by the Saints in the fourth round (108th overall) of the 2006 NFL Draft and spent the first 11 seasons of his 12-year playing career with the Saints. Overall, he started 183 career regular season games at right guard for the Saints (2006-16) and Green Bay Packers (2017), 169 for the Black and Gold. Evans was a six-time Pro Bowl selection, a five-time *Associated Press* All-Pro and was named to the Pro Football Hall of Fame's 2020's All-Decade Team, as New Orleans finished in the Top Ten in total offense each of the 11 seasons he lined up for the Saints, while the 196 sacks surrendered by the offensive line over the period were the lowest in the NFC and second-lowest in the NFL. After being selected as a consensus All-Rookie in 2006, Evans was a Pro Bowl starter and consensus first-team All-Pro each season from 2009-12. He was inducted into the Saints Hall of Fame in 2020, the Louisiana Sports Hall of Fame in 2022, was a semifinalist for the Pro Football Hall of Fame's Class of 2023 and was just announced as a semifinalist for the Class of 2024.

Defensive Assistant **Matt Giordano** - Giordano was a fourth round draft pick of the Indianapolis Colts in 2005 and enjoyed a nine-year NFL career with the Colts (2005-08), Green Bay Packers (2009), Saints (2010), Oakland Raiders (2011-12) and St. Louis Rams (2013), starting 30-of-116 career games, accumulating 202 tackles, one sack, 11 interceptions, including two returned for touchdowns, 16 passes defended, two forced fumbles, 52 special teams stop and one coverage fumble recovery. He also appeared in seven postseason games for the Colts and Packers and was a member of Indianapolis' Super Bowl XLI championship team.

Secondary Coach **Marcus Robertson** - Robertson played in the NFL for 12 years with the Houston Oilers/Tennessee Titans (1991-00) and the Seattle Seahawks (2001-02) after entering the league with Houston as a fourth-round selection (102nd overall) in the 1991 NFL Draft out of Iowa State. Robertson was an *Associated Press* first-team All-Pro at free safety in 1993 and 1997. The Pasadena, Calif. native finished his playing career with the Seattle Seahawks from 2001-02.

Since 2008, the Saints have posted an 85-41 regular season home record, fifth in the NFL. In 2022, New Orleans improved upon their 2021 record at the Caesars Superdome of 2-5, going 4-4 and winning back to back contests at their home stadium for the first time since the middle of the 2020 campaign. The Saints are 4-3 in 2023, already clinching their first .500 home record since 2020 and looking with a win over Atlanta in the regular season finale to finish with a winning home record for the first time since 2020's 6-2 mark.

SHUTOUT CITY

New Orleans rebounded from an Oct. 1 26-9 loss to Tampa Bay with an Oct. 8, 34-0 shutout victory over New England with significant contributions on defense that played turnover free football, defense that forced three turnovers and special teams that won the field position battle. The shutout victory was the largest margin of victory in a shutout at New England in their franchise's history. Including a 9-0 win at Tampa Bay on Dec. 9, 2021 and a 24-0 win over Las Vegas on Oct. 30, 2022, the Saints are the only NFL team to have three shutouts in the past three seasons. Buffalo (2), Jacksonville (2) and New England (2) are the only other teams to have multiple shutouts in the past three seasons.

BUCKING THE ODDS

The Saints have a long tradition of finding players as free agents signed after the draft that make an impact immediately or developing their careers initially on the team's practice squad. Several undrafted Saints on the roster play key roles on offense, defense and special teams that the club developed.

WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed** came to New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Weber State in 2022 after being one of the all-time best Division FCS returners and after spending the first five weeks on the practice squad, made an immediate impact, becoming the only Saint to score a touchdown in each of his first two offensive touches. In the Dec. 18 win over Atlanta, he finished with three receptions for 95 yards, with a 68-yard TD grab from Taysom Hill, the longest play from scrimmage of the season for New Orleans and the fifth-longest receiving TD by a Saints rookie all-time. In the Jan. 1 victory at Philadelphia, he led the team in receiving for the third consecutive week, posting six receptions for 79 yards, including a 58-yard grab to set up a field goal. Overall, he carried four times for 57 yards with a 44-yard touchdown, caught 28 passes for 488 yards (17.4 avg.) with two TDs, returned 20 punts for 193 yards (9.7 avg.) and returned 14 kickoffs for 320 yards (22.9 avg.).

In 2023, Shaheed is no longer a secret, as he has caught 43 passes for 654 yards (15.2 avg.) with four touchdown grabs, including seven receptions of 40-or-more yards, while also carrying seven times for 37 yards and ranking second in the NFC and third in the NFL in punt return average (14.0) and eighth in the league in all purpose yards (1,396) despite missing two contests with a quad injury. On Sept. 24 in Green Bay, he had his first career punt return for a touchdown, the second-longest scoring return in franchise history (76 yards). Oct. 1, vs. Tampa Bay, Shaheed had a 29-yard return, making him the first Saint to have a return of at least 25 yards in back to back contests since Darren Sproles (9/25-10/2/11).

Oct. 29, at Indianapolis, Shaheed had a breakout performance, catching three passes for 153 yards (51.0 avg.), including a 58-yard touchdown grab. Shaheed's 51.0 yards per reception average was ranked third in team history as he became only the third Saint to record 150+ yards receiving on three catches. Shaheed also added four punt returns for 46 yards to total 199 all-purpose yards.

TE **Juwan Johnson** led his position group with four touch-down receptions in 2021, converting to the position after playing wide receiver in college and starting his Black and Gold career in 2020 signing as an undrafted free agent from Oregon. In 2022, he led his position group in receiving with 42 grabs for 508 yards with a club-best and career-high seven touchdowns, tied for third at the position in the NFL. Johnson leads the Saints with 11 receiving touchdowns over the past two seasons, tied for fourth among league tight ends.

Johnson leads the tight ends with 34 grabs for 328 yards with four touchdown grabs, to tie for the team lead, in 2023.

DE **Carl Granderson** played in 15 games in 2021 with three starts and posted 24 tackles and three sacks. In 2022, he posted 53 stops (30 solo) and a career-high 5.5 sacks, recovering the first fumble of his career, December 5 at Tampa Bay. In the Christmas Eve victory at Cleveland, Granderson, sacked Browns QB Deshaun Watson at the Saints 22-yard line on fourth down with 19 seconds remaining in the fourth quarter to secure the win. The following week on January 1, 2023 at Philadelphia, he posted two stops, 1.5 sacks of QB Gardner Minshew, one stop for loss and two quarterback hits, as Granderson posted at least half a takedown in three consecutive weeks for the first time in his career.

Earning the starting right defensive end position in 2023, Granderson has posted a career-high 74 tackles, leads the team with a career-best 8.5 sacks, had defended one pass and has forced a fumble and recovered one, signing a four-year contract extension on September 23.

P **Lou Hedley** was signed following the 2023 NFL Draft by the Saints out of the University of Miami, where he played from 2019-22 and punted 206 times for 9,315 yards with a 45.2 gross punting average and 77 inside-the-20. The Australia native, who won the punting job in a competition in

training camp at 30 years old earned All-ACC second-team honors in 2021 and was selected as a semifinalist for the Ray Guy Award, honoring the nation's top punter. In 2020, Hedley was recognized with AP second-team All-American and as a Ray Guy Award finalist, as the Hurricanes ranked second in FBS in net punting average. In 2023, he's punted 71 times for 3,041 yards with a 42.8 gross punting average, a 39.6 net and 30 inside the 20-yard line, the second-highest total in franchise history since the statistic was first recorded in 1976.

K **Blake Grupe** was signed by New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Notre Dame, where he played his graduate campaign in 2022, after handling kicking duties at Arkansas State from 2017-21. In 2022, he led the Fighting Irish with 91 points on 14-of-19 field goals and a perfect 49-for-49 in PATs. The Missouri native was Arkansas State's career record holder in scoring (354), field goals (64) and PATs (162).

In 16 games, Grupe has made 28 of 35 field goal attempts and all 35 PAT attempts to lead the team with 118 points, with 67 touchbacks on kickoffs, ranked ninth in the NFL. Grupe's field goal total ties Wil Lutz for the team rookie record (28-2016) and also joins Lutz as the second Saints rookie to score 100 points.

Grupe enjoyed a standout performance in the Oct. 8 34-0 shutout at New England with a career-long 54-yard field goal and a 53-yarder and hitting all four PATs to go with five of his seven kickoffs sailing into the end zone for touchbacks. Grupe became the first Saint to boot two field goals of at least 50 yards in a contest since John Carney (at St Louis, 9/26/04), only the fifth Saint to do so overall and only the sixth occurrence. He earned NFC Special Teams Player of the Week. On Nov. 26 at Atlanta, Grupe drilled a career-high five field goals, the ninth time a Saint has kicked five field goals, the first time a Saints rookie has, as he scored all of New Orleans' 15 points.

Wide Receiver **Keith Kirkwood** originally joined the Saints as an undrafted free agent out of Temple in 2018. The New Jersey native spent the first two months of his rookie season on the New Orleans practice squad, before being signed to the active roster at midseason and recording 13 receptions for 209 yards (16.1 avg.) with two TDs. He added one more scoring grab in the NFC Divisional Playoff win over Philadelphia to help the Saints advance to the NFC Championship. After spending most of 2019 on Injured Reserve and playing for Carolina from 2020-21, Kirkwood returned to New Orleans in 2022, where he contributed on offense and special teams. On Nov. 26 at Atlanta, he contributed with two grabs for 21 yards and had a special teams stop. On Dec. 17, vs. The New York Giants, he started and caught a seven-yard touchdown pass, his first scoring grab since 2018.

PRACTICE MAKES PERFECT

A spot on the practice squad is another avenue to eventually get onto the active roster and have the opportunity to contribute. Below is an overview of seven key contributors players on the club's 53-man roster with extensive practice squad experience.

TE **Juwan Johnson** was signed by New Orleans out of Oregon, where he spent his graduate transfer season, following the 2020 NFL Draft as a wideout. Recording four receptions for 39 yards in seven contests, Johnson spent the majority of his rookie season on the practice squad. Converted to tight end in 2021 and leading the position group with four touchdowns, Johnson took advantage of his first full offseason strength and conditioning program in 2022, led the tight ends group with 42 receptions for 508 yards with a club-best seven TD grabs, tied for third in the league at his position. In 2023, Johnson leads the tight ends with 34 grabs for 328 yards and four touchdowns despite missing four games with a calf injury. He enjoyed a breakout performance in Sunday's win at Tampa Bay, recording a career-high six receptions for a career-best 90 yards with a first quarter touchdown to help put New Orleans on top for good, as well as a season-long 32-yard grab.

TEAM NOTES

After spending his first three seasons with the Seattle Seahawks, contributing on defense and special teams, DB **Ugo Amadi** split the 2022 campaign between the Titans active roster and the Chiefs practice squad, also appearing in one contest for Super Bowl champion Kansas City. Possessing the versatility to play in multiple roles, Amadi secured a roster spot with the Saints in the preseason, recording eight tackles, one interception, two passes defended and one coverage stop. He's contributed on defense with four tackles and two passes defended and on special teams with two stops in all 16 contests.

After splitting his rookie season in 2018 between the practice squad and active roster, DB **J.T. Gray** enjoyed a breakthrough campaign in 2019, when he was selected AP second-team All-Pro when he recorded 16 special teams tackles, a blocked punt and a coverage fumble recovery. In 2021, he was selected as a first-team All-Pro and to his first career Pro Bowl (starter), when he led the NFL with 19 special teams tackles (league-leading 16 solo). Gray led the team with 12 coverage stops in 2022, despite missing three games (hamstring), the third time in four seasons he led New Orleans in coverage tackles. He has a team-high ten special teams stops and one defensive tackle in 2023 despite missing three games. On Dec. 21, at the L.A. Rams, Gray got his hands on a punt that landed for only an eight-yard gain. Backed by Gray's performance, leadership and knowledge, New Orleans is ranked first in the NFL in opponent punt return average (5.6).

WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed** came to New Orleans as one of the all-time best Division I-AA returners and after spending the first five weeks on the practice squad, made a quick impact on Oct. 16 vs. Cincinnati with a 44-yard rushing TD. With his 53-yard receiving TD on Oct. 20 at Arizona, Shaheed became the only Saint to score touchdowns on each of his first two career offensive touches. In addition to finishing with 28 grabs for 488 yards (17.4 avg.) with two TDs, Shaheed also handled return duties for New Orleans, bringing back 20 punts for 193 yards (9.7 avg.). He made contributions in the Sept. 10 opening win over Tennessee with a career-high 216 all-purpose yards, including five receptions for 89 yards, including a 19-yard touchdown and a late fourth quarter 41-yard grab to help secure the victory. In the Sept. 18 win over Carolina, he posted four catches for 63 yards (15.8 avg.), including a fourth quarter 45-yard grab. On Sept. 24 at Green Bay, Shaheed had a 76-yard punt return for a touchdown.

In 2023, Shaheed has caught 43 passes for 654 yards (15.2 avg.) with three touchdown receptions, including a club-best seven grabs of 40-or-more yards, while also carrying seven times for 37 yards and ranking third in the NFL

in punt return average (14.0) and ninth in the league in all-purpose yards (1,396).

WR **Keith Kirkwood** originally joined the Saints as an undrafted free agent out of Temple in 2018. The New Jersey native spent the first two months of his rookie season on the practice squad, before being signed to the active roster at midseason and recording 13 receptions for 209 yards (16.1 avg.) with two TDs. He added one more scoring grab in the NFC Divisional Playoff win over Philadelphia to help the Saints advance to the NFC Championship. After spending most of 2019 campaign on Injured Reserve and playing for Carolina from 2020-21, Kirkwood returned to New Orleans in 2022, where he has contributed on both offense and special teams. He scored his first regular season touchdown in five seasons, a seven-yard pass from QB Derek Carr in the Dec. 17 24-6 victory over the New York Giants.

LB **Nephi Sewell** was signed by New Orleans following the 2022 NFL Draft out of Utah and appeared in four games as a rookie, contributing on special teams, while spending the remainder of the campaign on the practice squad. Sewell progressed on both defense and special teams and secured a spot on the 53-man roster in 2023, posting five coverage tackles and one forced fumble and nine defensive stops, before suffering a season-ending knee injury in Sunday's win at Tampa Bay.

Originally a third round draft pick of the Broncos in 2018 out of Boston College, CB **Isaac Yiadom** has played in 86 games with 27 starts for Denver, the Giants, Green Bay, Houston and New Orleans and has posted 137 tackles, a split sack, two interceptions, 26 passes defended, one forced fumble, one fumble recovery and 26 special teams stops. After starting 2022 with the Texans, Yiadom joined the Saints practice squad midway through the season and upon being signed to the active roster, recorded two special teams stops in six appearances.

In 2023, Yiadom has contributed on both defense and special teams, playing in all 16 games with seven starts, recording 30 tackles, one interception, a career-high 14 passes defended to rank second on the team and tie for eighth in the NFL, his first career fumble recovery and six coverage stops to also rank second on the team, tying his career-high.

Originally a first round pick (19th overall) of the Cleveland Browns in 2015, OL **Cameron Erving** has played in 97 career regular season games with 57 starts at all five positions for Cleveland (2015-16), Kansas City (2017-19), Dallas (2020), Carolina (2021-22) and New Orleans. In 2023, spending most of the season on the practice squad, Erving started at right tackle, Oct. 19, vs. Jacksonville and took over the duties in Sunday's win at Tampa Bay after Landon Young suffered a knee injury.

Spending half the season on the team's practice squad, Abram has played in eight games with two starts, making 15 tackles (10 solo), one pick, one pass defense, one forced fumble and two coverage stops. On Sunday at Tampa Bay, he received his second start of the season and finished with five stops, his first pick as a Saint and his first career forced fumble.

On the following pages are a synopsis of several returning players and newcomers through the draft and free agency to the 2023 Saints offensive line:

Tackle/Guard James Hurst - A nine-year National Football League veteran who was signed as a free agent from Baltimore in 2020, Hurst has 148 career regular season appearances with 93 starts at four different positions on the inside and outside. His versatility came in handy in 2020, as he started two contests at left tackle and one at left guard, while the Saints gained over 200 yards rushing each time. In 2021, Hurst moved into the starting lineup for eight games at left tackle in place of an injured Armstead, two at left guard in place of an injured Andrus Peat and three at right tackle for an injured Ryan Ramczyk. Hurst started 15 games at left tackle and one at left guard in 2022. In 2023, Hurst has opened 12 games at left guard, including the last eight contests, one at left tackle and one at right guard.

Tackle/Guard Andrus Peat - A first round selection (13th overall) in the 2015 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Peat was considered one of the top college linemen in 2014. In nine

seasons, he's played in 110 regular season games with 101 starts, opening a contest at every position except center. In 2020, he opened 13 contests at left guard as he was part of the NFC Pro squad for the third consecutive season. In 2021, he opened the first six contests, where New Orleans got off to a 4-2 start before suffering a season-ending pectoral injury. In his return to the starting lineup in the 2022 season opener in Atlanta, New Orleans rushed for 151 yards. In back-to-back weeks, Peat was a part of rushing efforts of 200-yards plus by the club for the first time since 2020. In 2023, Peat has started one contest at left guard and the last nine at left tackle as the offensive line has solidified with his return to the starting lineup.

Center/Guard Erik McCoy - New Orleans traded up in the second round of the 2019 NFL Draft to select this standout from Texas A&M, who was a three-year starter, anchoring the middle of the Aggies line. In 2018, he was a team captain who paved the way for the SEC's leading rusher and in 2019 was the first Saint in franchise history to start at center in Week One, opening all 16 contests. McCoy has opened all 73 contests he has appeared in at center and signed a five-year contract extension with the team in 2022, having been selected as an offensive team captain for the first time in 2023.

Guard/Center Cesar Ruiz - The hard-working, talented and intelligent lineman is a perfect fit for New Orleans' culture. He was selected with the 24th pick in the 2020 NFL Draft out of the University of Michigan. The three-year letterman played in 36 games in college, starting his last 31 including the final 26 at center, earning All-Big Ten in 2019. Ruiz settled in at right guard in the last 15 games, with nine starts, as well as both postseason contests. When McCoy suffered a lower leg injury in the first quarter of the 2021 opening win over Green Bay, Ruiz transitioned over to his natural position, where the Saints did not give up a sack in his four starts at center. He returned to right guard on Oct. 25 at Seattle and was the only lineman in 2021 to not miss a start. Ruiz opened 13 games at right guard and one at center in 2022 before suffering a season-ending foot injury Dec. 18, vs. Atlanta. The 46 consecutive starts for Ruiz at the time of his injury was the longest active streak for a Saint. Following an ardent rehab, Ruiz returned to the starting lineup for the season opener on Sept. 10, the day after signing a four-year contract extension.

Right Tackle Cameron Erving - Originally a first round pick (19th overall) of the Cleveland Browns in 2015, Erving has played in 97 career regular season games with 57 starts at all five positions for Cleveland (2015-16), Kansas City (2017-19), Dallas (2020), Carolina (2021-22) and New Orleans. In 2023, spending most of the season on the practice squad, Erving started at right tackle, Oct. 19, vs. Jacksonville and took over the duties in Sunday's win at Tampa Bay after Landon Young suffered a knee injury.

Tackle Landon Young - A mainstay at left tackle for his college career at the University of Kentucky, Young played in 49 contests with 30 starts in his college career. The Lexington, Ky. native was selected by New Orleans in the sixth round of the 2021 NFL Draft and held up to the competition in training camp to snare a roster spot. Young opened one contest at right tackle in 2021 and has served as Ryan Ramczyk's backup on the right side, also playing jumbo tight end. In 2022, Young showed versatility. On Oct. 13 at Pittsburgh, he slide over to left tackle for the second half to replace Hurst (concussion) and opened this the Nov. 20 win over the Rams at one of the league's most challenging positions. In the Jan. 1, 2023 win at Philadelphia, Young played the final three quarters in place of Ramczyk (hip) and then started the following week's finale vs. Carolina. Young has opened the last three games in place of Ryan Ramczyk (Injured Reserve) at right tackle.

Guard/Center Max Garcia - The nine-year NFL veteran was signed as a free agent at the start of training camp. This versatile lineman has played in 121 regular season games with 62 starts for New Orleans, Arizona and Denver, opening the three contests at left guard in 2023. Originally a fourth round draft pick of Denver out of Florida in 2015, who started five contests as a rookie for the Super Bowl 50 champions, Garcia has opened 46 games at right guard, 12 at left guard and four at center.

A third round draft pick of the Denver Broncos in 2018 out of Boston College, in addition to starting 27 of his 86 career contests on defense and posting 137 tackles, a split sack, two interceptions, 26 passes defended, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery, **Isaac Yiadom** has recorded 26 career coverage stops for five teams. Brought up to the active roster during Gray's injury, Yiadom brought a boost to the Saints coverage units with three stops, remaining an integral part of the group after Gray's return to the lineup and re-signing in the offseason. In 2023, Yiadom is ranked third on the team with six special teams tackles, tying his career-high. On Oct. 29, at Indianapolis, Yiadom downed a punt at the Colts three-yard line in the third quarter. In the Nov. 5 win over Chicago, Yiadom played a key role on a punt with the Bears starting field position at their two-yard line.

One of the club's two third round draft picks in 2020, **Zack Baun**, a former Wisconsin standout, has embraced work on the team's special teams units. He has recorded 22 tackles on coverage, one blocked field goal and 64 defensive stops, two sacks, one interception and two passes defended. On Sept. 10 at Tennessee, Baun got his hands on a punt that went out of bounds one yard past the line of scrimmage, a game-changing play.

Selected in the fifth round of the 2022 NFL Draft by the Saints out of Appalachian State, LB **D'Marco Jackson** came to New Orleans as the only Football Bowl Subdivision player with more than 200 tackles and 25 stops for loss in the 2020 and 2021 seasons combined. After missing his entire rookie campaign with a hamstring injury, Jackson's hard-working and hard-hitting mentality has proven to be a good fit on the team's coverage units as he is ranked second on the team with eight stops and the fumble recovery for a touchdown.

DB **Lonnie Johnson** was signed by New Orleans as a free agent in the offseason after spending his first three seasons with the Houston Texans and the 2022 campaign with the Tennessee Titans. Johnson has posted 19 career special teams stops, including five with New Orleans in 2023. On Oct. 19, at Jacksonville, Johnson had a fumble recovery off a muffed punt for his first career special teams take-away.

Signed as an undrafted free agent in 2022 out of Utah, Sewell appeared in four games on special teams as a rookie. In 2023, the sure tackler secured a spot on the team's coverage units and is tied fourth on the team with five stops to go with nine defensive tackles and the Dec. 10 special teams forced fumble on a punt play.

Signed as a free agent at the start of the offseason, Amadi has career totals of 21 special teams stops and one forced fumble, recording his first two stops in coverage of 2023 in the past four weeks.

Claimed off of waivers by New Orleans from Denver in 2021 at the conclusion of the 2023 preseason, FB **Adam Prentice** has played in 30 games with six starts and has carried nine times for 26 yards, including a seven-yard run for a first down in Sunday's win at Tampa Bay. The California native has also caught seven passes for 32 yards and recorded nine special teams stops, including a career-high five in 2023. Prentice's contributions in the kicking game the remainder of the season will be crucial following several injuries in the kicking game.

The success of the team's coverage units have allowed New Orleans to rank first in the NFL in opponent punt return average.

QUARTERBACKS

DEREK CARR

- On March 6, 2023 the Saints agreed to terms with Derek Carr on a four-year contract to solidify the quarterback position. He spent the first nine seasons of his NFL career with the Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders. Originally selected in the second round (36th overall) of the 2014 NFL Draft by the Raiders out of Fresno State, the Bakersfield, Calif. native has started all 158 career regular season games he has played in, completing 3,554-of-5,478 passes (64.9 percent) for 38,836 yards with 238 touchdown passes, 107 interceptions and a 91.9 passer rating, while adding 879 rushing yards and six touchdowns. From 2014-22 as a member of the Raiders, Carr was selected to four Pro Bowl Games (2015-17, 2022) and set numerous team passing records including the franchise's career passing yardage and touchdown pass marks and single-season mark in passing yards (4,804 in 2021), as the only signal-caller in the team's history with multiple seasons reaching the 4,000 yard mark. He also holds franchise records from his Raiders tenure for multiple-touchdown pass games (69), contests with a passer rating of at least 100.0 (47) and 300-yard passing performances (33).
- Since entering the league in 2014, Carr ranks second in the NFL in completions, fourth in passing yardage and seventh in passing touchdowns. He became the third quarterback in history to pass for 3,000-plus yards in each of his first ten seasons, joining Pro Football Hall of Fame signal-caller Peyton Manning and Russell Wilson. He is just the fourth player in NFL history to reach 35,000 passing yards in his first nine seasons. He has completed 300 passes of 25+ yards since he entered the league in 2014, the fourth-most in the NFL over that span. His 158 starts are the most by a quarterback since 2014.
- Carr has started all 16 games in 2023 and has completed 353-of-520 passes (67.9%) for 3,614 yards with 21 touchdowns, eight interceptions and a 94.7 passer rating. Carr is ranked second in the NFL in fourth quarter passer rating (105.2), fifth in completion percentage and tenth in passer rating.
- Carr enjoyed a successful Saints debut in the Sept. 10 win over Tennessee, when he completed 23-of-33 passes (69.7%) for 305 yards with one touchdown, one interception and a 96.1 passer rating.
- Carr helped lead New Orleans to a 20-17 victory at Carolina on Monday Night Football on Sept. 18, when in the second half, he completed a 42-yard pass to Chris Olave and a 45-yard pass to Rashid Shaheed to set up the Saints' two touchdowns.
- On Sept. 24 at Green Bay, Carr had completed 13-of-18 (72.2%) of his passes for 103 yards with an eight-yard scoring throw to TE Jimmy Graham and a 104.6 passer rating to help put New Orleans ahead 17-0 over the Packers before being forced to leave in the third quarter with a sprained AC joint injury.
- Carr was a model of efficiency in the Oct. 8 34-0 shutout of New England, completing 18-of-26 passes (69.2%) for 183 yards with two touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 114.7 passer rating, his highest as a Saint to date.
- On Oct. 15 at Houston, Carr finished 32-of-50 passing (64.0 pct.) for 353 yards, one touchdown and one interception, also carrying two yards for a first down. It was the tenth-highest passing yardage total of Carr's career and his highest total as a Saint to date.
- On Oct. 19 vs. Jacksonville, Carr completed 33-of-55 passes for 301 yards with a 17-yard touchdown to Michael Thomas, as he became the first Saints passer to have back-to-back weeks of at least 300 yards passing since Drew Brees in Weeks 14 and 15 of the 2019 campaign.
- In the Oct. 29 win at Indianapolis, Carr was in complete control, as he completed 19-of-27 passes for 310 yards with two touchdowns, including a 58-yard touchdown pass to Shaheed, one of two completions of 50-yards or more to the speedster, as he became the first Saints passer to have three consecutive weeks of at least 300 yards passing since Brees did so in four straight from Dec. 21, 2015-Sept. 11, 2016. It was also the first time Carr threw for 300 yards in three straight contests since Weeks One-Three of 2021.
- In the Nov. 5 24-17 win over Chicago, Carr completed 25-of-34 passes (73.5%) for 211 yards, two TDs and a 108.8 passer rating. Carr engineered a fourth quarter, go-ahead, game-winning drive, where he completed both passing attempts for 18 yards.
- On Nov. 26, at Atlanta, Carr completed 24-of-38 passes for 304 yards with three completions of 25 yards or more for his fifth performance of at least 300 yards of the season.
- On Dec. 3, vs. Detroit, Carr completed 17-of-22 passes (77.3%) for 226 yards with one touchdown and a 105.5 passer rating, as he completed his final 15 attempts.
- On Dec. 10, vs. Carolina, Carr completed 18-of-26 passes for 119 yards with touchdown passes to Jimmy Graham and Chris Olave to help New Orleans to the season sweep over the Panthers.
- On Dec. 17, vs. the New York Giants, despite the absence of the team's top two wide receivers on the depth chart, Carr completed passes to ten different teammates, going 23-of-28 for 218 yards with three touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 134.8 passer rating to lead the Saints to their second straight victory. Carr set season-highs in completion percentage (82.1), scoring throws and passer rating.

•On Dec. 21 at the Los Angeles Rams, Carr completed 27-of-40 passes for 319 yards with three touchdowns, one interception and a 106.1 passer rating, as he reached the century mark in back-to-back occasions for the second time this season.

•In Sunday's 23-13 victory at Tampa Bay, Carr completed 24-of-32 passes for 197 yards with two touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 111.1 passer rating. Increasing his season touchdown pass total to 21, Carr achieved his ninth 20-scoring throw season since coming into the league, tied for the most over that period with Tom Brady and Russell Wilson and joined Dan Marino (10), Peyton Manning (10), Wilson (10) and Matt Ryan (9), as only the fifth player to have at least nine 20 touchdown seasons in his first ten campaigns.

JAMEIS WINSTON

- The 2013 Heisman Trophy winner at Florida State and the first pick in the 2015 NFL Draft, Winston has appeared in 92 games with 80 starts, completing 1,763-of-2,882 passes (61.2%) for 22,104 yards with 141 touchdowns, 99 interceptions and an 87.0 rating, adding 1,214 rushing yards and 11 touchdowns. In 2021, before suffering a season-ending knee injury in Week Eight, Winston completed 95-of-161 passes for 1,170 yards, 14 touchdowns, three interceptions and a 102.8 passer rating, ranked first in the NFL at the time of his injury in touchdown percentage (8.7).

- Serving as the backup to Carr with extensive starting experience, Winston has completed 25-of-47 passes for 264 yards with two touchdowns and three interceptions.

TAYSOM HILL

- Hill's brought unheralded versatility to offense and special teams. A participant on special teams from midseason in 2017, as well as a signal-caller and as a runner and receiver, Hill has played in 96 regular season games with 40 starts at several positions. He has carried 392 times for 2,108 yards, the most by a Saint not to play running back, with 27 touchdowns, tied for seventh in club records, caught 72 passes for 728 yards with 12 touchdowns, completed 191-of-298 passes (64.1%) for 2,348 yards with 11 touchdowns, returned 19 kickoffs for 447 yards, made 15 special teams tackles and one blocked punt.

- In 2022, Hill assisted in multiple facets. Contributing on offense and special teams in the opener at Atlanta, he carried four times for a club-best 81 yards (20.3 avg.), including a career-long 57-yard carry, as well as an 11-yard rushing TD on the same first quarter drive. Overall, he ranked second on the team in rushing with 96 carries for a career-high 575 yards (club-best 6.0 avg.) with a club-best seven rushing TDs, nine catches for 75 yards with two TDs, leading the team in total TDs, while completing 13-of-19 passes for 240 yards with two TDs and a 146.3 passer rating.

- In 2023, Hill ranks second on the team in rushing with 75 carries for 350 yards (4.7 avg.) with four touchdowns, has caught a career-high 29 passes for 263 yards with three touchdowns, has completed six of 11 passes for 83 yards with one touchdown with a 118.8 passer rating, has returned a kickoff 18 yards and has one special teams tackle.

RENAISSANCE MAN

Hill enjoyed an all-around standout versatile performance in the November 5 win over Chicago, when he led the team in rushing, carrying 11 times for 52 yards (4.7 avg.), completed a three-yard touchdown pass to tight end Juwan Johnson and caught four passes for 13 yards with one touchdown. With his touchdown reception from Carr, the tenth of his career, Hill became the first player since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger and the first player since quarterback/halfback Frank Gifford to have at least ten career rushing touchdowns, passing touchdowns and receiving touchdowns. Hill has 27 rushing touchdowns, 11 touchdown passes and ten touchdowns in his career and became the second player in NFL history with at least 25 rushing touchdowns, ten touchdown passes and ten touchdown receptions, joining Gifford (34 rushing touchdowns, 14 touchdown passes and 43 touchdown receptions. Given the historical element of Hill's accomplishments, the Pro Football Hall of Fame has requested several items that were worn and used by Hill in his historic performance that now stands as an exhibit to fans at the museum.

RUNNING BACKS

ALVIN KAMARA

- A talented runner and receiver with a 5-10, 215-pound frame who was selected by the Saints in the third round of the 2017 NFL Draft out of the University of Tennessee, Kamara enjoyed an outstanding rookie campaign. He ranked first on the club and sixth in the NFL in yards from scrimmage (1,554), second on the team in rushing and receiving, carrying 120 times for 728 yards (6.1 avg.) with eight TDs and a two-point conversion, catching 81 passes for 826 yards (10.2 avg.) with five TDs and a kickoff return for a TD for a club rookie record 14 total scores, tied for second in the NFL. Kamara finished first in the NFL in yards per carry.

- Kamara was the first Saints offensive rookie selected to the Pro Bowl since Rueben Mayes (1986), as an AP second team All-Pro (flex), the clubs' first rookie All-Pro since 1993. He was named *The Sporting News* NFL Rookie of the Year and AP NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year.

- In 13 games in 2023, Kamara leads New Orleans in rushing with 180 carries for 694 yards and a club-best five touchdowns, leading National Football League running backs in receiving with 75 receptions for 466 yards with one touchdown for a club-best 1,160 total yards from scrimmage and six total touchdowns.

SCRIMMAGE LEADER

Since entering the NFL in 2017, Kamara ranks third in the league in total yards from scrimmage (10,048). Kamara is the first NFL player since Julio Jones (2014-19) to have six consecutive seasons of at least 1,300 total yards from scrimmage.

Kamara in his first game returning from a knee injury in the December 12, 2021 30-9 win at the New York Jets rushed 27 times for 120 yards with a score and caught 4 passes for 25 yards. Kamara's touchdown run in the second quarter was the 67th score of his career and tied him for the second-most touchdowns in a player's first 70 games since the league merger behind LaDainian Tomlinson's 68 touchdowns in 67 career games.

TWO-POINT LEADER

JAMAAL WILLIAMS

• Signed by the Saints as an unrestricted free agent from Detroit in the offseason, Williams is a talented runner who had a breakout season in 2022, as he led the National Football League and set a Lions single-season franchise record for rushing touchdowns with 17. In 17 games with nine starts for Detroit, Williams added on 262 attempts for 1,066 rushing yards and 12 receptions for 73 yards, producing the first 1,000 yard rushing season of his career.

• The former BYU star's talent came consistently all over the field, as well as in short bursts, as ten of his rushing touchdowns in 2022 came from exactly one yard out, tied for third-most in NFL history. A sound ballcarrier, he went 752 career touches before fumbling the ball and became the league's first active running back to reach 600 carries before fumbling.

• Since being drafted by Green Bay in the fourth round (134th overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft, Williams has played in 102 games with 43 starts, totaling 1,007 attempts for 3,932 yards and 30 touchdowns, while adding 175 receptions for 1,245 yards and eight touchdowns against only five fumbles.

• In the first two games of 2023, Williams rushed for 74 yards and caught a pass for eight yards before being put on Injured Reserve with a hamstring injury. WIDE RECEIVERS

CHRIS OLAVE

• A talented wide receiver who became one of the most prolific receivers in Buckeyes history, Olave played in 47 games and caught 176 passes for 2,711 yards (15.4 avg.) with 35 touchdowns. Olave's 35 career touchdown receptions set an Ohio State program record and ranks fourth in Big Ten history. His 11 career 100-yard games also ranks second in school history. Olave entered the starting lineup in 2019 with immediate results. He helped lead the Buckeyes to three consecutive Big Ten championships (2018-2020) and back-to-back College Football Playoff appearances (2019, 2020). In the 2020 CFP Semifinal vs. Clemson, Olave had a career night, hauling in six passes for 132 yards and two touchdowns in a 49-28 win, securing a bid to play in the championship game. Olave seamlessly integrated into the Saints offense following a standout senior campaign, where he caught 65 passes for 936 yards (14.4 avg.) and 13 touchdowns, tied for sixth nationally, as he was selected as an AFCA first-team All-American and a consensus second-team All-American.

• Following a September, where he captured NFL Offensive Rookie of the Month honors with 17 grabs for a league rookie-best 268 yards, including scoring receiving touchdowns in back to back contests, Olave led the team in receiving, yards per catch and receiving yardage with 72 grabs for 1,042 yards (14.5 avg.) with four touchdowns along with a successful two-point conversion, ranking second among rookies in receiving yardage and tied for second in catches and third down grabs (26). Olave became the first Saints rookie since Danny Abramowicz (1967) to lead the team in receiving, receiving yardage and yards per catch in his first campaign. The receiving yardage total was second all-time among Saints rookies, as he was only the third Black and Gold rookie to reach 1,000.

TIGHT ENDS

JUWAN JOHNSON

- The former Penn State and Oregon wideout joined the Saints in 2020 following the NFL Draft and transitioned to tight end his second season. In 2022, the New Jersey native had a breakout campaign as he appeared in 16 games with 12 starts and finished with 42 receptions for 508 yards and a team-best seven touchdown grabs. Johnson's touchdown grab total was tied for third among National Football League tight ends. Overall, Johnson's 15 touchdown grabs since 2021 lead the team.

- In 12 games with ten starts in 2023, Johnson has 34 receptions for 328 yards with four touchdowns to lead the tight end corps in all major receiving categories and tie for the overall team lead in scoring grabs. After missing four contests with a calf injury, Johnson's returned to action Oct. 29 and has been an asset as a receiver and a blocker.

FOSTER MOREAU

- This veteran tight end and New Orleans native enters his fifth National Football League season and first with the Black and Gold after spending his first four seasons with the Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders. In his career, Moreau has appeared in 75 regular season games with 43 starts and has recorded 111 receptions for 1,297 yards (11.7 avg.) with 13 touchdowns and has posted at least 30 catches in each of his last two campaigns. In 2022, the former Jesuit High School and LSU standout set career-highs in receptions (33) and receiving yards (420), while adding two touchdowns.

- Moreau got on the scoreboard for the first time as a Saint on Oct. 8 at New England with a fourth quarter six-yard grab. He has 20 grabs for 190 yards to rank second among Saints tight ends in receptions and receiving yardage, with one scoring grab.

JIMMY GRAHAM

• New Orleans' third round draft choice in 2010 after playing four years of basketball and just one year of football at the University of Miami (Fla.). Graham broke out in his second year with the Saints totaling 99 catches for 1,310 yards with 11 touchdowns and went on to lead the team in receiving for four consecutive seasons. Graham's production has been among the top 10 in NFL history at the tight end position in all three major categories: receptions, yards, and receiving touchdowns. Graham posts career totals of 719 receptions, 8,545 yards, and 89 touchdowns. His 89 receiving touchdowns rank 4th all time among NFL tight ends, while his 55 touchdowns as a Saint rank 2nd in franchise history. He and Kansas City's Travis Kelce are the only two tight ends in NFL history to have multiple seasons of 1,200-plus receiving yards and 10-plus receiving touchdowns. Graham returns to New Orleans, the location of his most personal and team success, after playing in seven campaigns with three other teams and is tied for the team lead with four scoring grabs

DEMARIO DAVIS

• This dependable and sure-tackling defender joined the New Orleans Saints in 2018 after spending his first six National Football League seasons with the New York Jets and Cleveland Browns. For his career, the Brandon, Miss. native has appeared in 193 career regular season games with 179 starts for the Jets (2012-15, 2017), Cleveland (2016) and the Saints (2018-), recording 1,326 stops (854 solo), 42.5 sacks, three interceptions, 55 passes defended, four forced fumbles, eight fumble recoveries and 24 special teams tackles. In 2023, Davis joined Bobby Wagner and Lavonte David as only the third active NFL player with 1,300.

• In 2018, Davis opened all 16 contests and led the team with 110 stops (74 solo), five sacks to lead the linebackers, four passes defended, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. Davis' abilities to diagnose and tackle played a key role in New Orleans ranking second in the NFL in opponent rushing yards per game and opponent rushing yards per play. Participating in the postseason for the first time, Davis led the defense with 22 stops (15 solo), an interception in the NFC Championship and a pass defense.

IRON MAN

Davis who had never missed a game in his career until December 27, 2021 vs. Miami due to COVID-19 protocols, ranks as one of the league's most durable defenders, while playing one of the game's most physically demanding positions. His 158 consecutive games played streak was the longest in the NFL by a position player and his 79 straight games started were the most at his position. In 2022, Davis was one of three Black and Gold starting defenders to open every contest, joining safety Tyrann Mathieu and defensive tackle David Onyemata. More impressive, he was the only linebacker in the NFL to play in every defensive snap for his teams.

PETE WERNER

- New Orleans selected this three-year starter from Ohio State in the second round of the 2021 NFL Draft. The Indianapolis native finished his college career playing in 47 career games with 35 starts, recording 185 tackles (111 solo), 16 stops for loss, four sacks, 11 passes defended, four forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Werner helped power the Buckeyes to the College Football Playoff championship game as a senior in 2020, when he was voted by Big Ten coaches as a first-team All-Conference selection and a Butkus Award semifinalist, posting 54 tackles, 2.5 stops for loss, one sack and two forced fumbles. Werner made his second career start Oct. 3 vs. the Giants and recorded a ten tackles. With 13 stops in Week Five at Washington, he became the first Saints rookie defender to reach double-digit totals in back-to-back games. He ranked fifth on the team with 59 tackles.

- Werner enjoyed a standout 2022 season, appearing in 12 games with 11 starts at weakside linebacker and ranked third on the team and second at the linebacker position, despite missing five games, with 79 tackles (55 solo), three stop for loss, three passes defended, two forced fumbles and one special teams tackle.

- Werner got off to an impressive start for the 2023 season, finishing second on the team with eight stops in the Sept.

10 season-opening win over Tennessee, one stop for loss and a split sack, his first career takedown. He recorded his first career interception this on October 8 in a 34-0 shutout at New England. Leading or tying for the team lead in stops in the last three contests, Werner is ranked second on the team with 89 stops, a split sack, one interception, one pass defense and two fumble recoveries, the most recent which took place in the first half of the Dec. 10 28-6 win over Carolina.

Mathieu was selected by the Arizona Cardinals in the third round (69th overall) in the 2013 NFL Draft out of LSU and has played for the Cardinals (2013-17), Houston Texans (2018), Kansas City Chiefs (2019-21) and now the Saints. In 11 NFL seasons, he has played in 162 regular season games with 153 starts and has posted career totals of 769 tackles (633 solo), 42 stops for loss, ten sacks for a loss of 78 yards, 32 interceptions for 427 returns yards, four brought back for touchdowns, 98 passes defended, four forced fumbles, seven fumble recoveries and five special teams stops. Mathieu has been selected to three Pro Bowls, three Associated Press All-Pro teams and the Pro Football Hall of Fame's 2010's All-Decade Team.

SECONDARY

Mathieu came to New Orleans after starting all 16 games he played in for Kansas City in 2021 and recording 76 tackles, one sack, a career-high three fumble recoveries, one sack and two interceptions to earn his second consecutive Pro Bowl selection. With a team-leading three picks and one fumble recovery, adding up to a team-best four takeaways to go with a career-high 91 tackles (club-best 64 solo) to rank third on the team and first in the secondary.

Mathieu's 32 picks since coming into the league in 2013 are tied for second in the National Football League after recording two picks for the fourth time in his career on November 26 at Atlanta. With three interceptions in 2023, Mathieu is second on the team.

CB PAULSON ADEBO

• New Orleans' third round selection (76th overall) in the 2021 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Adebo overcame not playing college football in 2020 to make significant contributions to the Saints secondary in his first season with the club. The Texas native finished his college career playing in 22 games with 21 starts for Stanford and recording 97 tackles, 34 passes defended and eight interceptions, earning All-Pac 12 honors in both 2018 and 2019.

• Adebo showed his development by opening opposite Lattimore in the 2021 regular season opening win vs. Green Bay and returning a pick 33 yards in the third quarter to become the first Saints defender to have an interception in his NFL debut since LB James Allen vs. Tampa Bay on September 8, 2002. He then added a second pick in the Week Five win at Washington. With a pick in the regular season finale at Atlanta, Adebo finished his rookie campaign ranked fifth on the club with 63 tackles (54 solo), tied for first with three picks and added eight passes defended and two special teams stops.

• Adebo fought off injuries in 2022 and played in 13 games with 12 starts to lead the team's corners with 60 tackles (51 solo) and added seven passes defended for the NFL's second-ranked club in opponent passing yards per game.

• Sharpened by an extensive training camp competition, Adebo is enjoying a standout campaign despite missing two contests with a hamstring injury. Following a two interception, three total takeaway performance in The November 5 24-17 win over Chicago that earned him NFC Defensive Player of the Week, Adebo has 69 tackles, four interceptions, 17 passes defended, two forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries, also adding a pick on a two-point attempt in Sunday's 23-13 win at Tampa Bay. Adebo's four interceptions are tied for seventh in the NFL, while his six total takeaways are tied for second in the league with Baltimore Ravens S Geno Stone and Buffalo CB Rasul Douglas. His team-leading pass defense total for the team leading the NFL in passes defended is tied for third in the league.

CB ALONTAE TAYLOR

• Selected by the Saints in the second round (49th overall) of the 2022 NFL Draft out of Tennessee, Taylor shook off early injuries to play in 13 games with nine starts and posted 45 tackles (38 solo) and a club-best 11 passes defended.

SAINTS POSTGAME NOTES

- The New Orleans Saints defeated the Tampa Bay Buccaneers 23-13 Sunday.
- With the win, the Saints improve to 8-8 on the year. They move into a tie for first place in the NFC South with the Buccaneers. For the Saints to win the NFC South, they will need to defeat the Atlanta Falcons in Week 18 at the Caesars Superdome and the Buccaneers will have to lose to or tie the Carolina Panthers in Charlotte.
- The Saints improve to 40-24 all time against Tampa Bay, including 19-10 on the road. They have won six of their last seven contests at Raymond James Stadium.
- The Buccaneers became the second team the Saints have 40 wins against, joining the Atlanta Falcons.
- The Saints outgained Tampa Bay on the ground 108-57.
- The Saints outgained the Buccaneers 202-44 in the first half. They held the ball for 19:46 compared to just 10:14 for Tampa.
- 42 of Tampa's 44 yards in the first half came on one drive. Outside of that nine-play, 42-yard drive, the Bucs totaled three yards on 10 plays. The 44 net yards surrendered were the lowest first half total given up by New Orleans in 2023.
- The Saints converted 13 first downs and allowed just three to the Buccaneers in the first half.
- New Orleans allowed the Bucs to complete just two of eight (25.0%) third-down attempts.
- The Saints dominated time of possession, 36:38-23:22. They ran 70 offensive plays to Tampa's 50.
- New Orleans won the turnover battle 4-0, forcing two fumbles and intercepting Buccaneers QB Baker Mayfield twice. It was the first time Mayfield was picked off twice in a contest this season.
- QB **Derek Carr** completed 24-of-32 passes for 197 yards and two touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 111.1 passer rating.
- Carr surpassed Jim Kelly to move into 31st all the all-time passing touchdown list, tossing his 238th score in the second quarter.
- TE **Juwan Johnson** had a monster day, tallying six catches for 70 yards and a touchdown in the first half alone. Johnson finished with a career-high eight catches for a career-best 90 yards, including a season-long 32-yard grab and the score.
- RB **Alvin Kamara** carried the ball 10 times for 45 yards (4.5 avg.) before leaving the game at halftime with an ankle injury. Combined with two receptions for four yards, Kamara surpassed the 10,000-yard total yards from scrimmage mark, the first Saint to ever do so (10,048).
- RB **Jamaal Williams** carried the load in the second half, totaling 19 attempts for a season-high 58 yards, also catching four passes for 13 yards for a team-best 71 total yards from scrimmage.
- TE **Taysom Hill** completed one pass for 11 yards, carried the ball twice for one yard and caught two passes for 30 yards and, including a 22-yard touchdown. It is Hill's fourth-career game with a touchdown catch and a pass completion.
- WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed** had two catches for 14 yards, returned two punts for 27 yards and two kickoffs for 41 yards for 82 all-purpose yards.
- The New Orleans offensive line surrendered only one sack.
- LB **Pete Werner** led the Saints with nine tackles (eight solo).
- Rookie DT **Bryan Bresee** finished with two tackles (one solo) and one sack.
- LB **Zack Baun** finished with three solo tackles, one sack, one pass defense and one special teams stop.

- DB **Johnathan Abram** recorded his first career forced fumble and first interception of the season to go with one pass defense. He finished with five solo tackles on the afternoon.
- LB **Demaro Davis** finished the game with four tackles (one solo), one stop for loss and one fumble recovery.
- CB **Alontae Taylor** recorded his first career interception in the second quarter, picking off Mayfield at the Saints two-yard line.
- CB **Paulson Adebo** finished with four tackles (three solo) and one pass defense and also intercepted a two-point attempt late in the contest to secure a 23-12 victory with 1:37 left.
- P **Lou Hedley** pinned his 30th punt of the season inside of the 20, moving into second place for most punts inside the 20-yard line in Saints history.
- K **Blake Grupe** went a perfect three-for-three on field goals, connected on both PAT attempts and had all six kickoffs sail through the end zone for touchbacks. He is now tied with Wil Lutz (2016) for the most field goals by a rookie in New Orleans history.



BUCCANEERS POSTGAME QUOTES 12-31-23

HEAD COACH TODD BOWLES

(On what went wrong today)

"Our coaches have to come up with a better gameplan on both sides of the ball, and the players have to play it better. We were off kilter from the start. They (New Orleans) did a good job manufacturing a drive down the field keeping us off balance. They did a good job getting turnovers. They did what they were supposed to do, and came in here to do it, and we didn't."

(On the lack of pressure on Saints QB Derek Carr)

"We had to stop it because the ball was coming out pretty quick. He wasn't holding the ball long enough for us to get the pass rush, so we tried to cover. I didn't think in the first half we tackled well when the ball was dumped down there. I thought they cleaned it up some in the second half."

(On the sense of urgency coming into today's game with a chance to clinch the NFC South division title)

"[There] was still urgency – they just played better than us, you know? They played better than us, they executed better than us, they won the turnover battle. Usually when you do those types of things in the games that we play against them, you win the game."

(On not getting WR Mike Evans more involved)

"They did a good job of taking away Mike and Chris [Godwin] early on. They disguised it well and ran guys over to him. If it looked like he was there, it wasn't there. And they did a good job beating us up front at the line of scrimmage on both sides of the ball."

(On how well can the Buccaneers put today's loss behind them and move forward to getting a win next week against Carolina)

"We have to. It'll sink in today. Obviously, we know we have to win next week. We weren't trying to bring it to next week. Obviously, we wanted to win the one today. We didn't win the one today. We have to come back on Tuesday, and we have to be really focused. We've got to be ready, and we have to execute. [It] doesn't matter who we played today – a good team, a bad team, a college team, a high school team – we wouldn't have won the game."

(On the status of QB Baker Mayfield)

"He went back out there. Obviously, it was a late hit. I've got to look at the film again to see what happened to him, but he went back out there after he got hurt. So, we'll see how he feels."

(On the productivity of Saints tight ends Juwan Johnson and Taysom Hill)

"Like I said, we didn't tackle well underneath coverage. We had leverage – we didn't tackle well."



(On his message to the team)

"We definitely stunk it up as coaches. We stunk it up as players. We didn't play up to our standard. We're trying to win our division and we didn't win one. We have another chance next week and we [need to] come back Tuesday ready to work. By any means necessary, we have to show up Sunday."

(On why he thinks the Saints defense has found success against the Buccaneers at Raymond James Stadium the last few years)

"It's not just us. They play like that against everybody if you watch them. They have a hell of a defense. They have some guys over there that can make plays. Dennis (Allen) does a good job scheming us up. We've just got to do a better job of executing."

QUARTERBACK BAKER MAYFIELD

(On how he feels after the late hit towards the end of that game)

"Ribs don't feel too great right now. X-rays, as of right now, are negative so that's good but we'll do more exams to see what's really bugging me. But, don't have anything right now besides just sore."

(On how this is the second game that he's been hit late by the Saints)

"Yeah, it was one of those late scramble plays that – you know, last second throwing the ball the Chris [Godwin], obviously. Yeah, they're going to take hits. They're a physical team. They played that way today. They hit us right in the mouth from the get-go. So, not exactly the mentality that we wanted to come out with. Needed to be the more physical team and we weren't today."

(On why the offense had trouble clicking today)

"I think there's many reasons. But, starting with physicality like I just mentioned. We have just got to execute better. I think there was – I think when we look back at the tape, a lot of little things and the things we were doing well, we didn't today. And it starts – you know, timing on some of the past game stuff up front and the run game. Like I said, they were more physical today and they threw us off our tempo."

(On if the Buccaneers didn't have the same urgency as they did in recent games)

"I wouldn't say that. I think we prepared great all week. I think mentality-wise, preparation – we were great. We just did not come out and bring it to Sunday. Did not translate. And so, can't have that. We've got to be able to show up when we need it. But luckily, we have one more game to seal this thing. Once again, back's against the wall. So, somewhere we've been before and we've got to get it fixed and move forward."

(On his message to the team this week)

"Same thing. One-game-at-a-time mentality. It doesn't change for us. We've got to win this next game in Carolina to win the division and go from there. All you need is to get a chance to get in and we're still sitting right where we need to be. Obviously, would've loved to have done it today with two games left, but it didn't happen. So, one-game mentality and our season is on the line."



(On what was different to cause four turnovers this game)

“Yeah, the first one – I’ve got to give Trey [Palmer] a better chance to run under it. One-on-one ball – Alontae Taylor made a hell of a play, to be honest with you. And the other one, just a horrible throw. I didn’t get my feet over to the right side. I think I’ll see the footwork on that when I watch the film and see if that was probably the main issue. And then we’ve just got to take care of it. Obviously, Rachaad [White] was trying to make a big play. They swarm to the ball. They’re a physical defense. They rallied to the ball so we’ve got to take care of it too.”

(On how hard it was for things to work today)

“Yeah, it’s just one of those days where nothing seems to get going. And then when we had a chance – yeah, couldn’t get it. One of those days where you look at it and see the things that went wrong and be like ‘Alright, we’ve got to get it fixed. Here’s where it went wrong’ and move on.”

(On needed to bounce back quickly)

“Yeah, everything we did to bounce back from our midseason lull – we put ourselves in a position to win the division, so it’s still right in front of us. This hurts because, like I said, we would have loved to have done it at home. But, didn’t get it done so we’ll have to next week on the road.”

(On if a win against the Panthers will be sentimental for him)

“My mentality playing against the Panthers – the guys in the locker room are great. For other reasons, I’ll be extremely motivated to play. Obviously, the division is on the line. There’s many things. Everyone in our locker room should be motivated, not just me, personally.”

(On how tough it is to play with sore ribs as a quarterback.)

“It’ll get easier throughout the week. The first few days are always the worst. I’ve had a few broken ribs here and there and obviously, like I said, nothing showed to that extent as of right now so yeah, I’ll be able to deal with it and go from there.”

LINEBACKER LAVONTE DAVID

(On the disappointment of today’s performance and result)

“Very disappointing. It was like we didn’t know what was at stake. We came out very flat on both sides of the ball. It’s something that we’ve got to take to the chin. They came out and beat us. We’ve definitely got to get better. Learn from it and get better next week.”

(On what the Saints did right today)

“You’ve got to give them their props, they won the game. But at the end of the day, we didn’t play our best on both sides of the ball. We came out very flat and [weren’t] executing. It’s disappointing for me to say, but we [weren’t] ready today. I don’t know for what reason. With everything at stake, we weren’t ready today. I wasn’t ready as a leader to get everybody ready and going. We’re definitely going to have to get ready for next week. That’s the good thing about it is we’ve got another opportunity next week and we’re going to learn from this one.”



(On what needs to be corrected to be ready to go next week vs. the Carolina Panthers)
“It’s just knowing you only get these opportunities once in a lifetime. All these opportunities don’t come around often. You have to know what’s at stake. We’ve just got to be better. You can’t take this stuff for granted. We worked so hard to get here and we just let it go like that. We can’t allow that to happen. We’ve got to learn from this, look ourselves in the mirror this week, be better, come out better next week and have a better showing.”

(On getting the sense of urgency back)
“It’s a one-game season. We can get it back ASAP – we’ve just got to go back to the drawing board. Get back to us being us. [The things that] had us on that four-game winning streak – us playing with swagger and us executing on both sides of the ball. We’ve got to get back to that.”

WIDE RECEIVER MIKE EVANS

(On how much the magnitude of this game weighed on his mind)
“Not mine. It didn’t weigh on my mind at all. I was coming out here hoping we would play some great ball like we have been. The Saints stopped us. They played great today.”

(On if he thought the loss was due to self-inflicted errors)
“It was definitely a lot of self-inflicted errors, but they definitely were the more physical team today. A lot of cloud coverage over top of me for the majority of the game. I was able to make some plays when I got one-on-one [coverage], but it wasn’t much.”

(On regaining momentum going into a must win game next week)
“Keep working. You know we wanted to win this one really bad, and it didn’t happen. Fortunately, for us, we have a chance to clinch the division next week against a very scrappy team. I know their record doesn’t show it, but they’re really scrappy, so we have to come with it next week.”

(On if there is something the Saints do that makes it difficult to move the ball)
They’re very sound. They’re smart on defense. When they play zone, they’re talking out there, they’re communicating. They’re very physical and they’re nasty.”

RUNNING BACK RACHAAD WHITE

(On trying to create momentum after falling behind early in the game)
“That is just very hard. That is just very rare – we had zero [points] going into the fourth quarter. Sometimes you [have] to just charge it to the game. Like, you just have them days at the end of the day. Unfortunately for us, we had a bad game at a bad time.”

(On having another opportunity next week to win the NFC South)
“And that’s all we can ask for. That’s all you can ask for in life is an opportunity, so we are going to do our best to do what we need to do this week to prepare. We know Carolina [are not] going to be pushovers either. Like you said, it’s a division game, and they [are] going to come out swinging. We just have to make sure we swing first.”



(On how he plans to personally hit the reset button)

"Honestly, everything I was just saying. You have got to understand that it happened. You [are not always] going to have a great game or a good game. I was on a good stretch. I was on a good run and now defenses are on me. I have to do a better job at just looking, seeing how people are going to play me, and things like that. But, also understanding that losses come with the game and come with the territory. Like you said, we have another huge opportunity. That's all that matters is the next opportunity."

(On the message after the game)

"The message was really just look in the mirror. At the end of the day, you [have] to reassess. You [have] to look at the mistakes you made. After you look at that, you have to keep pushing, you have to keep fighting. I mean, we can't really dwell. So yes, after we correct what needs to be corrected, you [have] to move on to the next opportunity."

SAFETY ANTOINE WINFIELD JR.

(On the mindset of the team heading into next week)

"[The] mindset [is] win and we're in. We know it's a must win for us to get into the playoffs and that's going to be our mindset, right there."

(On his thoughts following Sunday's loss)

"Just get better and get ready for next week. That's all I'm thinking about – just making sure we are prepared next week to go ahead and win because, you know, it's a big game for us."

(On why the team came out flat on Sunday)

"It just happens – it's football. They came out and executed, and we didn't. So that's just what happened today."

SAINTS POSTGAME QUOTES 12-31-23

HEAD COACH DENNIS ALLEN

Opening Statement:

"Happy New Year to everybody. Good team win for our football team. [I] still feel like there were some things we could have done better. [I] still felt like there were a few things that we left out there on the field, but I thought, particularly in the first half, we played really well in the first half in all three phases. I thought the field position (battle) was a big part of the game. I think the takeaways in the game were a big part of the game. I think we ran the ball a little bit better offensively, which opened up some things in the passing game. We did a good job on third down, converting on third down. Look, there are a lot of good things that we did. Obviously the first drive of the game, taking it down there, being able to score points, putting seven on the board I thought was big for our football team. I am proud of the way that our guys continue to compete. I'm proud of the way our guys continue to fight, and I'm proud of the way that they played today. Now we [have] to digest this and then get ready for Atlanta."

(On if this game was a hard effort performance to pull off after the state of the team following last week's loss)

"I think state of the team is probably...I'm sure everybody has their own opinions about the state of the team, right? But I've never questioned the mindset of our team. I've never questioned the toughness of our team. I have never questioned the [competitiveness] of our team. Look, this game we play is hard. It's not easy. There are some times that you have to fight back after a tough loss, but I told the team last night we've got to handle hard well, and I thought our guys did that today."

(On how he feels about how his team responded to his message about doing hard well)

"Look, it's positive. I think when we have faced some adversity, I think our guys are generally respondent. We knew our backs were against the wall and we knew that if we didn't take care of business today, that it did not matter what happened anywhere else. We knew that we had to win this game, and I think our guys had the mindset that we were coming in here to win. And that's what they did."

(On S Johnathan Abram's performance)

"I thought he played really well. I was extremely proud of him, happy for him. The way he played — great effort play on the strip to cause the fumble that Demario [Davis] recovered. There [were] a number of things he did well, obviously that play stands out, but here's a guy that's been kind of on the practice squad, then he's on the roster. [He] probably hadn't gotten as many opportunities as he would like, but he's one of the ones that's got probably the most time on the iPad in terms of studying what the opponents are doing. He works extremely hard at it, and he got his opportunity, and he performed well."



(On what went into the decision of Abram playing)

"Well I think...look, primarily it was because we had a rookie player (Jordan Howden) that missed the early part of the week practice and I think, particularly for a young player, I think you've got to practice to be able to play and play well. And look, it doesn't really matter how he gets the opportunity, it's about taking advantage of the opportunity and I thought he did a good job of that."

(On TE Juwan Johnson's performance)

"I thought he played really well today. Here's another guy that... look, we have had a number of guys that have kind of gotten challenged a little bit, and they have responded to the challenge. Juwan Johnson being one of them. I think the last couple of weeks Juwan has really responded to it and performed well. Obviously, the touchdown was a big play in the game. The third down catch down the middle of the field was a huge play in the game — it changes field position. He catches the boot, I guess it was the fourth quarter there, and gets us in some good field position, so I thought he played well. I thought he played through a little bit of a shoulder injury and came back out and played and competed, so I was really proud of him."

(On the first half being the best the team has played collectively on both sides of the ball)

"Yeah, look, it's been a long season, so I think there have been some times where I feel like our team's played really well in a lot of spurts. But yes, I do. I feel like that was all three phases, I think, that contributed to us being able to get out to that lead in the first half."

(On QB Derek Carr taking a different approach)

"Well, I think A, he's feeling a little bit better. Obviously, he's had a couple of things that have nagged him throughout the season, and I think he's probably...Look, nobody is 100% healthy at this time of the year, but I think he's closer to that now than maybe where he was a month or a month-and-a-half ago. So yeah, I think he's been performing much better over the last month or six weeks of the season. I think a lot of that is health related."

(On if the team's performance today is in line with his expectations for the team)

"Still not perfect, but it's been improved. We're guaranteed one more opportunity to go and prove it a little bit more and that's what we're going to focus on."

(On CB Alontae Taylor's performance today)

"Alontae was awesome today, really. Again, that's the enjoyment I get out of coaching — when the guy hits a rough patch and you challenge him. Look, he got benched. That is hard, that's hard to take [but] he responded the right way. You guys asked me, 'How is he going to respond?' I think he responded the right way. I think he did that today, so I was extremely proud of him."

(On the use of tight ends today)

"The fact that we used the tight ends says we felt like there was something maybe we could hopefully take advantage of. And again, look you never know exactly how the game is going to play out. I mean, we kind of have an idea of what they may try to do and yet we don't have a contract with them, they can kind of do whatever they want to do and we have to be able to react to it. In this game, there are some things that I think that they were trying to do to obviously take away some of our receivers. So, the tight ends played a little bit of a bigger role — specifically, Juwan [Johnson]."



(On Johnson's Confidence in himself)

"You guys have heard this because I got it from one of my mentors, but confidence is born from demonstrated ability. That's the same thing for us as coaches – when we see you do it, we have more confidence that you can do it again. When you as a player see yourself do it, you have more confidence that you can do it again. So, I think all of those things work together. But yeah, certainly we have confidence in him and throwing him the football."

(On RB Alvin Kamara's injury)

"Yeah, so he sprained his ankle...I think it was on the sideline over there, in the first half right before the end of the half, when he got tackled on their sideline over there. [He] kind of came in, got it looked at, came out after the half to try to test it out, and just didn't feel like he was going to be able to be functional enough to help us win."

(On if it was a high-ankle sprain)

"I don't know that. I know it's an ankle sprain, I haven't gotten into all of the details as to what it is."

(On the players that got pulled out for knee injuries)

"Nephi [Sewell] has a pretty significant knee injury that he is going to miss significant time with. Landon [Young], I think it's the same knee he hurt earlier in the training camp, so very similar situation with him. I have to get all my injury report, but I know that was a couple that were pretty significant."

(On T Cameron Erving stepping in and replacing T Landon Young)

"Obviously, when you're watching the offense, it's much more difficult to see everything that's happening inside. Usually, if I don't hear his name being said, then I'm assuming he's doing some pretty decent things. I didn't hear his name [being] called out a lot so, nothing stood out to me like, 'Ah, that was not good.' So, I'm assuming that he at least stepped in and did a decent job."

(On the key to slowing down the Buccaneers offense)

"The biggest thing for this game was we had to win the line of scrimmage. We had to win the line of scrimmage on offense, had to win the line of scrimmage on defense. Our OL [Offensive Line] and our DL [Defensive Line] had to play well for us for us to have a chance to win this game. Like I said earlier, it wasn't perfect, but I thought, overall, we were able to make enough plays up-front on both sides of the ball to do enough to win the line of scrimmage, to give ourselves a chance to win."

(On what went wrong in the final minutes)

"We can't let the ball get over our heads. We didn't play as well as we needed to in those two instances. That's why when you look at the game you say, 'Well it wasn't perfect.' So, we've got to go back, make the corrections, [and] fix that because that's inexcusable to let the ball go over your head. When you get in those situations, you have been playing well for such a long time during it one way, don't change how you are playing. There's that fine line of, 'Well am I just going to play soft and easy and let them throw the ball underneath? Or am I going to play the way I've been playing for the last 58 minutes?' So, we'll look at it and our guys will learn from it."



QUARTERBACK DEREK CARR

(On the need to start fast) “We needed to start fast against this team. They’re leading the division—excellent on defense. Coach [Dennis Allen] challenged us this week, individually [and] as a team—certain units. So, getting that score early, I think just lit everybody up. [TE] Juwan [Johnson] made a great, tough catch—tight window. Had to take a hit for us, he did, and I think that ignited everybody. I really do. The belief—it’s one thing to keep being positive. But, when it comes to fruition, I think the belief gets higher.”

(On his on-field connection with TE Juwan Johnson) “I thought we began to do things nice and see certain things and then he gets hurt. Then you saw Taysom [Hill] step up and fill that role—how many catches he’s had—can’t remember—the Houston game and so on and so forth. But, making big plays for me and for us—especially down in the red zone again today. I think you’ve seen that position and role get filled by Taysom and other guys. Then, Juwan comes back healthy and his role is his role. When the plays are dialed to him, he’s able to make those plays. None bigger than the one down the middle to get us out of [being] backed up. To catch that and make a front flip, one of the best safeties in the league hitting him, that was unbelievable.”

(On if his early chemistry in training camp with Juwan Johnson affects their play now) “Yeah, absolutely. [Juwan Johnson] is another guy, that when the defense is doing their thing and I’m doing my extra work, he’s down there catching balls for me. He’s down there working with me – getting me extra reps. We threw that route, I think, three or four times extra on that left side in practice. We felt like we didn’t really like it and we needed to work on it. Man, he catches it – catches a touchdown today. So, we’re always working at that chemistry. It’s never perfect. This is NFL football – it’s never going to be perfect. But, we definitely rely on all those reps we’ve had together, for sure.”

(On Dennis Allen saying his play has been better since he has been healthier) “You know me, man. I can’t make an excuse or because I have been playing well. ‘Oh, yeah. My shoulder – I feel better.’ I do feel better – I can always be honest with you. I do feel better. But, I’ll let [Dennis Allen] and other guys [can] talk on that.”

(On the touchdown pass to Taysom Hill) “Well, he did a great job of using help to get a pick. Taysom’s so fast that he got the guy in a trail position and I was able to not overthrow him – just give him a ball that he can react to. He made an outstanding play and I’m thankful he landed in the end zone.”

(On being able to get Adam Prentice a carry after his fumble in the first meeting) “Yeah, that was awesome. I’m not going to lie to you, when I went to hand that ball [off], that’s usually [Alvin Kamara] back there. When I went [back], I was like, ‘Adam!’ – and he took off. It was a huge run for us to take some time off of the clock. But, I know for his confidence, too, he was probably thinking of the last time he played these guys. I even told [running backs coach] Joel [Thomas] on the sideline that was huge for [Prentice] to be in there for that play and have that opportunity to show – because I’m sure he was thinking of the last game. Just like I was thinking of the last game. I think I was fresh off the Green Bay game. I was very frustrated with certain things with things I could and couldn’t do. So, it’s always good to win a division game to get back at somebody and get a win because they got after us the first time.”



(On players stepping up to combat the loss of Landon Young and Alvin Kamara)

"Those are two guys, you know, again you can't just replace guys. Landon and AK are great teammates, great players, great people for our locker room and for our team and I thought that Cam [Erving] stepped up huge for us coming in in that role. He has done that before for us in the season and he's played well. I thought he did a great job. I thought Jamaal [Williams] stepping up - that's no shock to me - Jamaal is one of the best running backs - power running backs that you are going to find. And he's one of the most enthusiastic - he's a different cat, but he's one of my favorite teammates I have ever had because of his love for, not only the game, but his love for his teammates. You know, he tells us all the time 'I'm going to run through someone's face for y'all, this ain't for me.' You know, and when you have a guy like that you can always go to bat with him and Taysom [Hill] could probably talk about him even more, you know, with the years they spent together, but the short time I have been with him, he brightens my day every time I see him and to see him get a lot of carries, make some tough yards for us today, against a really good run defense, I thought he did a good job."

(On Jonathan Abrams's successful performance)

"I was so happy. You know, we obviously were together with the Raiders. I've seen his development, I've seen his growth, and I'm more proud of who he's become off the field and the type of man he's become, the type of father he wants to be. You know, as much growth as he's made on the field, off the field he's done even better and I'm so proud of that because he's worked hard at it. I thank God for him because he's a great teammate, you know, even though on the scout team sometimes he's a saboteur and it is what it is because that's Jon. You know, but when he got his chance he made a lot of great plays."

(On team "playoff mentality" mindset)

"We're still alive playing for something - job's not done. You know, one of my favorite - my favorite athlete of all time, that is one of his most famous quotes. You know, 'job's not finished.' So until we run out of time I'm going to keep believing, I'm going to keep working. We can't feel satisfied because we have to win. You know, we came in with the expectation to win, we had to win, we did, it feels good, but we have to play another team that we didn't beat this year. And so I'm looking forward to that matchup and we'll start on them as soon as we can."

(On success against the Buccaneers defensive pressure)

"That was some of the most - that was the saw capital of the world today. They were bringing every form of corner, nickel, you know, safeties, and, you know, base linebackers, SAM, WILL, inside pressure, outside pressure, picks, stunts, and our guys didn't give up a sack. I know it says one on that sheet, that was my fault I thought I threw it away. So I want to credit our offensive line with an amazing job that they did. You know, our two offensive line coaches with the plan that they gave us. Because, you know, when they give us a plan and we go out there and execute it, it's awesome when you come away with those results. Because that's really tough to do against this team. They have a lot of disguises, they hide their pressures better than anybody else, they do a fantastic job, and they've played a lot of football together, you can tell. So, to come out of that with one sack, which was my fault, but none by the offensive line, that's an amazing feat that they had and they deserve a lot of credit."



SAFETY JOHNATHAN ABRAM

(On studying week in and week out.)

"I'm gradually growing as a player and I mean, the only way that you have any real thing, in life, is you have to put the time and effort in. So, I mean, that's kind of why I prepare the same because I never know – or anybody never knows – when your moment is going to come. So, first, I'll got to thank God for the moment. He gave me the opportunity to showcase everything that I've been learning because I haven't been the guy to soak in the moment of me being on the practice squad and any of those things. So, I kind of just show up the same, I study the same. So, from those moments, I study hard just so I can try to help the guys in the room make plays. So, when I was over there with the iPad and the pencil, I was taking notes. You know, charting the routes and things of that nature to try to help them be a step faster. Just trying to do my 1/11th."

(On what he saw this week that allowed them to lock-in this game.)

"Well, the coaches have done an amazing job of giving us the information of what they like to do and preparing us for really good gameplan to take away what they do best and make them play with their left hand. So, I think that was the biggest thing."

(On being a player waiting for his opportunity.)

"It's like any other thing in life. You've just got to put your faith in God and know that he will bring you through on the other side because it's not something easy to handle. We all want to be out there. We all want what we want out of life. Sometimes that doesn't align with what God has in store for you. So, you kind of just have to trust in Him and just do your part, just do your work and know that God is going to bring you through."

QUARTERBACK TAYSOM HILL

(On his touchdown reception)

"Yeah, I mean Derek [Carr] described it very well. We came out, we knew it was man [coverage], and that's what you're kind of hoping for when you're in my position. We had a nice natural pick and Derek gave me a good ball. That was it."

(On getting the tight ends involved and what it does for their offense)

"I don't know. I guess, typically, at the tight end role, you're catching balls over the middle and some of those balls typically end up being high-percentage throws. I look at some of the receptions we had in that room today and I felt like a lot of them moved the chains, so that was fun to see. And I think it was also one of those things [where] you don't know who it's going to be when you are playing the Saints offensively – is it going to be outside, 'Sheed' (Rashid Shaheed), Chris [Olave], Lynn [Bowden Jr.], A.T. [Perry], or are we going to have the guys inside in the tight end room and running backs? So, we have a lot of weapons and [there were] a lot of opportunities for the tight ends today."

(On if this was their most complete game of the season)

"Yeah, I think that's fair—offensive, defensive, special teams. It felt like it was a really clean game—defense forced four turnovers. You have a defense that creates four turnovers, and we don't turn it over. Special teams played a clean game, and man, it was great from every aspect."



TIGHT END JUWAN JOHNSON

(On how conversations with Dennis Allen challenging him)

"They were tough conversations. Whether I liked it or not, I had to receive it. He's our head coach and he challenged me and that's something I had to take full on. He knows I haven't had the year I necessarily wanted, haven't been performing the way I wanted to. He challenged me and those are some tough times, it's been a rough couple of weeks. I've leaned on my family, I've leaned on my teammates, I've leaned on the coaches, a bunch in the last few weeks and it's really paid off. God is good. I'm at this point right now. I'm performing now to what my capabilities are. There is still meat left on the bone. I still feel like there is more that I could be doing. I missed the pass later on in the second quarter that could have got us into some scoring positions, so there is definitely still meat on the bone that I can get. I feel like I'm just only touching the surface and there is more for me to do."

(On how he capitalized on an opportunity to prevail during the game)

"The opportunity was given, and I just had to capitalize on it. That's really what it was, just opportunity, preparation, attitude, just all of it kind of mixed together. Obviously, it is what it is, but right now the opportunities are given and I'm just trying to capitalize on them."

(On his attitude towards being challenged by Coach Dennis Allen)

"Whatever is private, always comes to light. The gameplan will reflect it, whatever the case might be. I was challenged and it was really about my attitude. It was really about how my teammates would see it, and that's really how the approach that I had. If I'm being challenged, they are going to see me and see how I react to it. That's something I really wanted to show my teammates, how I reacted to it and how I took it. It only caused me to work harder, it only caused me to study a bit harder, stay a little bit longer, show up a little bit earlier. It's just the attitude I have to have. I know I'm a guy that tries to do all the right things. When you try to do all the right things, it's a matter of doing the right things, better. So that's the one thing I try to do."

(On what went right during Sunday's game)

"Everything was clicking, everything worked out. The defense was playing lights out and the offense was playing really well. Just from the first drive, we were hitting on all cylinders. That's the good thing about it. When we have two positive plays starting off, to start the drive, just any drive, it's really going to end up being a positive outcome. That is what we tried to do, get first downs. Just try to have positive plays. There weren't a lot of negative plays in that first drive. So the way it happened, scored a touchdown, we were seven up, so we are feeling good, and have the defense feeling good, knowing that they could play from ahead."
