**THE MATCHUP**

The New Orleans Saints will host the New York Giants in Week 15 at the Caesars Superdome. The 6-7 Saints, currently in a three-way tie for first place in the NFC South with Atlanta and Tampa Bay, will be looking to get back to .500. The Black and Gold will play key games down the stretch against both clubs, at the Buccaneers on New Year's Eve and closing out the regular season hosting the Falcons in Week 18.

Sunday will mark the 32nd meeting between the Saints and Giants. New York leads the all-time series 17-14, defeating New Orleans 27-21 in overtime at the Superdome on Oct. 3, 2021, powered by a six-yard rushing touchdown by Giants RB **Saquon Barkley** to end the game..

In the Saints' 28-6 victory over the Carolina Panthers on Sunday, contributions on offense defense and special teams, all played a role in an important division victory that snapped a three-game losing streak and put New Orleans back in the thick of the race for the postseason.

Defensively, New Orleans did not surrender a touchdown for the third time this season, only the third team to do so in 2023, a mark which New Orleans has achieved in three of the last four campaigns. Rookie S **Jordan Howden** ruined a promising drive for Carolina, when he sacked QB **Bryce Young** at their 37-yard line and the ball was recov-

ered by LB **Pete Werner**. Howden led the Saints with ten stops and LB **Demario Davis** collected eight tackles, a season-high 1.5 sacks and a pass defense. The cornerback duo of **Alontae Taylor** and **Isaac Yiadom** combined for five passes defended, while CB **Paulson Adebbo** made a great effort play, stopping Panthers RB **Miles Sanders** at the New Orleans one-yard line at the end of a 48-yard run and the defense held Carolina to a field goal.

Offensively, New Orleans scored touchdowns in the red zone in three-of-four trips, including a rushing touchdown by RB **Alvin Kamara** and scoring grabs by TE **Jimmy Graham** and WR **Chris Olave**.

On special teams, New Orleans recorded their second touchdown of the season, the first time they have scored twice in the kicking game since the 2017 campaign, when LB **Nephi Sewell** forced a fumble on a punt play, with the ball being recovered by LB **D'Marco Jackson** and returned eight yards into the end zone.

New York ranks 26th in the NFL in defense, 29th against the run and 18th against the pass. The Giants are 31st overall in offense (14th rushing and 32nd passing). New Orleans is ranked 13th in the league in total offense (14th in passing, 20th in rushing) and 13th in defense (tied for 26th vs. the run, ranked seventh against the pass, surrendering only 189.5 net yards per game).

## THE COACHES

**Dennis Allen** was hired as the 17th head coach in New Orleans Saints history on February 8, 2022. Now in his 28th year coaching and 21st in the NFL, Allen has spent 13 seasons in New Orleans in two separate stints, including the six-and-a-half campaigns (2015-21) as the team's defensive coordinator prior to being promoted to head coach. He succeeded Sean Payton, who coached the team for 16 seasons, including the 2009 campaign, when Allen was secondary coach and ended with the Super Bowl XLIV championship. When Allen took control of a Black and Gold defense in Week 11 of the 2015 season that was ranked 32nd both in opponent net yards per game and opponent points per game, he methodically molded a unit that has finished in the top 10 in both categories each of the last three years. From 2017 to the present, New Orleans is the only defense in the NFL to rank in the top five in the National Football League in both opponent rushing yards per game and sacks.

In his first year as head coach of the Saints, Allen guided New Orleans through the challenge of significant injuries at several positions to win three of their last four games after a Week 14 bye and give up 20 or fewer points in the final eight contests of the season, ten points apiece in the final three.

Carrying over to the 2023 season, a stingy Saints defense is ranked third in the NFL with 14 interceptions with New Orleans currently tied for first place in the NFC South heading into Sunday's pivotal NFC matchup against the New York Giants.

Before rejoining the Saints coaching staff in 2015, Allen served as head coach of the Oakland Raiders from 2012-14 and as defensive coordinator of the Denver Broncos in 2011. Prior to his first stint in New Orleans from 2006-10, Allen was also an assistant with the Atlanta Falcons from 2002-05, where he received his NFL coaching start.

Over the course of his coaching career in New Orleans, Allen has coached linebacker Demario Davis and defensive end Cameron Jordan to career seasons. Davis has led the team in tackles in every campaign since signing with the club as an unrestricted free agent in 2018 and has garnered *AP* All-Pro honors four straight times. Since Allen returned to New Orleans in 2015, Jordan's 88.5 sacks rank third in the NFL.

Allen played safety at Texas A&M from 1992-95, where he started the final 21 games of his college career before being signed as an undrafted free agent by the Buffalo Bills in 1996. Prior to entering the National Football League coaching ranks in 2002, Allen served as a graduate assistant at his alma mater from 1996-99 and as secondary coach at the University of Tulsa from 2000-2001. He earned a bachelor of business administration degree and a

master's in kinesiology from Texas A&M.

Raised in Hurst, Texas, Allen and his wife, Alisson, have a daughter, Layla and a son, Garrison.

**Brian Daboll** was named Giants Head Coach on Jan. 29, 2022. Daboll joined the Buffalo Bills in 2018 as offensive coordinator under Sean McDermott. The previous year, he helped lead the University of Alabama to its 17th national championship as the Crimson Tide's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. I

In 2020, Daboll was voted *Associated Press* NFL Assistant Coach of the Year after the Bills finished 13-3 and ended the Patriots' streak of 11 consecutive division titles.

Daboll has 20 years of coaching experience. He spent 11 seasons with the New England Patriots (2000-06, 2013-16) in a variety of roles and helped the franchise win five Super Bowls (XXXVI, XXXVIII, XXXIX, XLIX and LI).

Daboll began his coaching career at age 24 in 2000 - Bill Belichick's first year with the team - as a defensive coaching assistant. He was promoted to wide receivers coach in 2002. Daboll left the Patriots to become the Jets' quarterbacks coach from 2007-08. He has been an offensive coordinator for the Cleveland Browns (2009-10), Miami Dolphins (2011) and Kansas City Chiefs (2012). Prior to entering the NFL, Daboll spent one year (1997) as a volunteer assistant at the College of William & Mary, where he first met McDermott, before serving two seasons (1998-99) as a graduate assistant for Nick Saban at Michigan State. Daboll played safety at Rochester from 1995-97.

## HALL OF FAME

### EVANS SEMIFINALIST FOR PRO FOOTBALL HALL

Former New Orleans Saints right guard Jahri Evans, currently serving as an offensive assistant on the coaching staff, is one of 25 Modern-Era Player Semifinalists for the Pro Football Hall of Fame's Class of 2024. Originally selected by New Orleans in the fourth round of the 2006 NFL Draft out of Division II Bloomsburg, Evans arrived in New Orleans and captured right guard duties in training camp. For his Black and Gold career, Evans started all 169 regular season games and ten postseason contests that he appeared in at right guard, finishing his career opening 14 contests at Green Bay in 2017. He was a five-time *Associated Press* All-Pro selection and was selected to six consecutive Pro Bowls from 2009-14. A 2010's selection to the All-Decade team, Evan's four first-team All-Pro selections are double that of any other player in Saints history.

Passing Game Coordinator/Quarterbacks Coach **Ronald Curry** - A seventh round draft pick (235th overall) of the Oakland Raiders in 2002 out of the University of North Carolina and played for Oakland from 2002-08, appearing in 76 games with 32 starts, registering 193 receptions for 2,347 yards with 13 touchdowns.

Assistant Offensive Line Coach **Kevin Carberry** - Prior to entering the coaching ranks, Carberry competed in training camps of the Cleveland Browns (2005) and Carolina Panthers (2006) and spent the 2005 season on the Detroit Lions practice squad. He also played for the Berlin Thunder of NFL Europe in the spring of 2006. From 2007-08, Carberry played in the Arena Football League for the New York Dragons and Philadelphia Soul and was a member of the Soul's 2008 Arena Bowl Championship squad, starting his coaching career at Chicago high schools in the off-seasons.

Offensive Assistant **Jahri Evans** - Evans was selected by the Saints in the fourth round (108th overall) of the 2006 NFL Draft and spent the first 11 seasons of his 12-year playing career with the Saints. Overall, he started 183 career regular season games at right guard for the Saints (2006-16) and Green Bay Packers (2017), 169 for the Black and Gold. Evans was a six-time Pro Bowl selection, a five-time *Associated Press* All-Pro and was named to the Pro Football Hall of Fame's 2020's All-Decade Team, as New Orleans finished in the Top Ten in total offense each of the 11 seasons he lined up for the Saints, while the 196 sacks surrendered by the offensive line over the period were the lowest in the NFC and second-lowest in the NFL. After being selected as a consensus All-Rookie in 2006, Evans was a Pro Bowl starter and consensus first-team All-Pro each season from 2009-12. He was inducted into the Saints Hall of Fame in 2020, the Louisiana Sports Hall of Fame in 2022, was a semifinalist for the Pro Football Hall of Fame's Class of 2023 and was just announced as a semifinalist for the Class of 2024.

Defensive Assistant **Matt Giordano** - Giordano was a fourth round draft pick of the Indianapolis Colts in 2005 and enjoyed a nine-year NFL career with the Colts (2005-08), Green Bay Packers (2009), Saints (2010), Oakland Raiders (2011-12) and St. Louis Rams (2013), starting 30-of-116 career games, accumulating 202 tackles, one sack, 11 interceptions, including two returned for touchdowns, 16 passes defensed, two forced fumbles, 52 special teams stop and one coverage fumble recovery. He also appeared in seven postseason games for the Colts and Packers and was a member of Indianapolis' Super Bowl XLI championship team.

### SHUTOUT CITY

New Orleans rebounded from a 26-9 loss to Tampa Bay on October 1 with a 34-0 shutout victory over New England on October 8 with significant contributions on defense that played turnover free football, defense that forced three turnovers and special teams that won the field position battle. The shutout victory was the largest margin of victory in a shutout at New England in their franchise's history. Including a 9-0 win at Tampa Bay on December 9, 2021 and a 24-0 win on October 30, 2022, the Saints are the only NFL team to have three shutouts in the past three seasons. Buffalo and New England (2) are the only other NFL teams to have multiple shutouts in the past three seasons.

### OPPONENT POINTS PER GAME

### BUCKING THE ODDS

The Saints have a long tradition of finding players as free agents signed after the draft that make an impact immediately or developing their careers initially on the team's practice squad. Several undrafted Saints on the roster play key roles on offense, defense and special teams that the club developed.

Wide Receiver/Return Specialist **Rashid Shaheed** came to New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Weber State in 2022 after being one of the all-time best Division FCS returners and after spending the first five weeks on the practice squad, made an immediate impact, becoming the only Saint to score a touchdown in each of his first two offensive touches. In the Dec. 18 win over Atlanta, he finished with three receptions for 95 yards, with a 68-yard touchdown grab from Taysom Hill, the longest play from scrimmage of the season for New Orleans and the fifth-longest receiving TD by a Saints rookie all-time. On the Christmas Eve win at Cleveland in challenging conditions, Shaheed led the team in receiving with four grabs for 41 yards. In the Jan. 1 victory at Philadelphia, he led the team in receiving for the third consecutive week, posting six receptions for 79 yards, including a 58-yard grab to set up a field goal. Overall, he carried four times for 57 yards with a

44-yard touchdown, caught 28 passes for 488 yards (17.4 avg.) with two TDs, returned 20 punts for 193 yards (9.7 avg.) and returned 14 kickoffs for 320 yards (22.9 avg.).

In 2023, Shaheed is no longer a secret, as he has caught 33 passes for 534 yards (16.2 avg.) with three touchdown grabs to tie for the team lead, including six receptions of 40-or-more yards, while also carrying six times for 33 yards and ranking first in the NFC and second in the NFL in punt return average (14.4) and eighth in the league in all purpose yards (1,169) despite missing the past two contests with a quad injury. On Sept. 24 in Green Bay, he had his first career punt return for a touchdown, the second-longest scoring return in franchise history (76 yards). Oct. 1, vs. Tampa Bay, Shaheed had a 29-yard return, making him the first Saint to have a return of at least 25 yards in back to back contests since Darren Sproles (9/25-10/2/11).

Oct. 29, at Indianapolis, Shaheed had a breakout performance, catching three passes for 153 yards (51.0 avg.), including a 58-yard touchdown grab. Shaheed's 51.0 yards per reception average was ranked third in team history as he became only the third Saint to record 150+ yards receiving on three catches. Shaheed also added four punt returns for 46 yards to total 199 all-purpose yards.

TE **Juwan Johnson** led his position group with four touch-down receptions in 2021, converting to the position after playing wide receiver in college and starting his Black and Gold career in 2020 signing as an undrafted free agent from Oregon. Johnson leads the tight ends with 20 grabs for 152 yards with one touchdown in 2023.

DE **Carl Granderson** played in 15 games in 2021 with three starts and posted 24 tackles and three sacks. In 2022, he posted 53 stops (30 solo) and a career-high 5.5 sacks, recovering the first fumble of his career, December 5 at Tampa Bay. In the Christmas Eve victory at Cleveland, Granderson, sacked Browns QB Deshaun Watson at the Saints 22-yard line on fourth down with 19 seconds remaining in the fourth quarter to secure the win. The following week on January 1, 2023 at Philadelphia, he posted two stops, 1.5 sacks of QB Gardner Minshew, one stop for loss and two quarterback hits, as Granderson posted at least half a takedown in three consecutive weeks for the first time in his career.

Earning the starting right defensive end position in 2023, Granderson has posted a career-high 62 tackles, leads the team with a career-best 6.5 sacks, had defended one pass and has forced a fumble and recovered one, signing a four

-year contract extension on September 23.

P **Lou Hedley** was signed following the 2023 NFL Draft by the Saints out of the University of Miami, where he played from 2019-22 and punted 206 times for 9,315 yards with a 45.2 gross punting average and 77 inside-the-20. The Australia native, who won the punting job in a competition in training camp at 30 years old earned All-ACC second-team honors in 2021 and was selected as a semifinalist for the Ray Guy Award, honoring the nation's top punter. In 2020, Hedley was recognized with AP second-team All-American and as a Ray Guy Award finalist, as the Hurricanes ranked second in FBS in net punting average. In 2023, he's punted 54 times for 2,335 yards with a 43.0 gross punting average, a 39.5 net and 24 inside the 20-yard line.

K **Blake Grupe** was signed by New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Notre Dame, where he played his graduate campaign in 2022, after handling kicking duties at Arkansas State from 2017-21. In 2022, he led the Fighting Irish with 91 points on 14-of-19 field goals and a perfect 49-for-49 in PATs. The Missouri native was Arkansas State's career record holder in scoring (354), field goals (64) and PATs (162).

In 13 games, Grupe has made 24 of 31 field goal attempts and all 27 PAT attempts to lead the team with 95 points, with 56 touchbacks on kickoffs, tied for seventh in the NFL.

Grupe enjoyed a standout performance in the Oct. 8 34-0 shutout at New England with a career-long 54-yard field goal and a 53-yarder and hitting all four PATs to go with five of his seven kickoffs sailing into the end zone for touchbacks. Grupe became the first Saint to boot two field goals of at least 50 yards in a contest since John Carney (at St Louis, 9/26/04), only the fifth Saint to do so overall and only the sixth occurrence. He earned NFC Special Teams Player of the Week.

On Nov. 26 at Atlanta, Grupe drilled a career-high five field goals, the ninth time a Saint has kicked five field goals, the first time a Saints rookie has, as he scored all of New Orleans' 15 points.

The New Jersey native spent the first two months of his rookie season on the New Orleans practice squad, before being signed to the active roster at midseason and recording 13 receptions for 209 yards (16.1 avg.) with two touchdowns. He added one more scoring grab in the NFC Divisional playoff win over Philadelphia to help the Saints advance to the NFC Championship. After spending most of the 2019 campaign on Injured Reserve and playing for Carolina from 2020-21, Kirkwood returned to New Orleans in 2022, where he contributed on offense and special teams. In the 2023 preseason opening win over Kansas City, he caught a four-yard touchdown pass from QB Derek Carr. On Nov. 26 at Atlanta, he contributed with two grabs for 21 yards and had a special teams stop.

## TEAM NOTES

### PRACTICE MAKES PERFECT

A spot on the practice squad is another avenue to eventually get onto the active roster and have the opportunity to contribute. Below is an overview of eight key contributors players on the club's 53-man roster with extensive practice squad experience.

Tight End **Juwan Johnson** was signed by New Orleans out of Oregon, where he spent his graduate transfer season, following the 2020 NFL Draft as a wideout. Recording four receptions for 39 yards in seven contests, Johnson spent the majority of his rookie season on the practice squad. Converted to tight end in 2021 and leading the position group with four touchdowns, Johnson took advantage of his first full offseason strength and conditioning program in 2022, led the tight ends group with 42 receptions for 508 yards with a club-best seven TD grabs, tied for third in the league at his position. In 2023, Johnson leads the tight ends with 20 grabs for 152 yards and one touchdown despite missing four games with a calf injury.

After spending his first three seasons with the Seattle Seahawks, contributing on both defense and special teams, defensive back **Ugo Amadi** split the 2022 campaign between the Titans active roster and the Kansas City Chiefs practice squad, also appearing in one contest for Super Bowl champion Kansas City. Possessing the versatility to play in multiple roles, Amadi secured a roster spot with the Saints in the 2023 preseason, recording eight tackles, one interception, two passes defensed and one coverage stop. He has contributed on both defense with one tackle and two passes defensed and on special teams with one stop in all 13 contests.

After splitting his rookie season in 2018 between the practice squad and active roster, defensive back **J.T. Gray** enjoyed a breakthrough campaign in 2019, when he was selected *Associated Press* second-team All-Pro when he recorded 16 special teams tackles, one blocked punt and one coverage fumble recovery. In 2021, he was selected as a first-team All-Pro and to his first career Pro Bowl (starter), when he led the NFL with 19 special teams tackles (league-leading 16 solo). Gray led the team with 12 special teams stops in 2022, despite missing three games with a hamstring, the third time in four seasons, he has led New Orleans in coverage tackles. He has a team-nine special teams stops and one defensive tackle in 2023 despite missing three games with injuries. Backed by Gray's performance, leadership and knowledge, New Orleans is ranked second in the NFL in opponent punt return average (5.0).

WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed** came to New Orleans as one of the all-time best Division I-AA returners and after spending

the first five weeks on the practice squad, made a quick impact on Oct. 16 vs. Cincinnati with a 44-yard rushing TD. With his 53-yard receiving touchdown on October 20 at Arizona, Shaheed became the only Saint to score touchdowns on each of his first two career offensive touches. In addition to finishing with 28 grabs for 488 yards (17.4 avg.) with two touchdowns, Shaheed also handled return duties for New Orleans since being activated, bringing back 20 punts for 193 yards (9.7 avg.). He made big contributions in the Sept. 10 season opening win over Tennessee with a career-high 216 all-purpose yards, including five receptions for 89 yards, including a 19-yard touchdown and a late fourth quarter 41-yard grab to help secure the victory. In the Sept. 18 win over Carolina, he posted four catches for 63 yards (15.8 avg.), including a fourth quarter 45-yard grab. On Sept. 24 at Green Bay, Shaheed had a 76-yard punt return for a touchdown.

In 2023, Shaheed has caught 33 passes for 534 yards (16.2 avg.) with three touchdown receptions to tie for the team lead, including six grabs of 40-or-more yards, while also carrying six times for 33 yards and ranking second in the NFL in punt return average (14.4) and eighth in the league in all-purpose yards (1,169).

WR **Keith Kirkwood** originally joined the Saints as an undrafted free agent out of Temple in 2018. The New Jersey native spent the first two months of his rookie season on the New Orleans practice squad, before being signed to the active roster at midseason and recording 13 receptions for 209 yards (16.1 avg.) with two touchdowns. He added one more scoring grab in the NFC Divisional Playoff win over Philadelphia to help the Saints advance to the NFC Championship. After spending most of the 2019 campaign on Injured Reserve and playing for Carolina from 2020-21, Kirkwood returned to New Orleans in 2022, where he has contributed on both offense and special teams.

LB **Nephi Sewell** was signed by New Orleans following the 2022 NFL Draft out of Utah and appeared in four games as a rookie, contributing on special teams, while spending the remainder of the campaign on the practice squad. Sewell has progressed on both defense and special teams and secured a spot on the 53-man roster, posting five coverage tackles and nine defensive stops, with a club-record eight on Sunday vs. Detroit

After splitting his rookie season between the active roster and practice squad, LB **Nephi Sewell** has solidified a spot in New Orleans' special teams and defensive rotation in 2023. He has ten defensive tackles, five special teams stop and comes off a key forced fumble recovered by teammate D'Marco Jackson for a touchdown Sunday vs. Carolina.

Originally a third round draft pick of the Broncos in 2018 out of Boston College, CB **Isaac Yiadom** has played in 83 games with 24 starts for Denver, the Giants, Green Bay, Houston and New Orleans and has posted 127 tackles, a split sack, two interceptions, 22 passes defensed, one forced fumble and 26 special teams stops. After starting 2022 with the Texans, Yiadom joined the Saints practice squad midway through the season and upon being signed to the active roster, recorded two special teams stops in six appearances.

In 2023, Yiadom has contributed on both defense and special teams, playing in all 13 games with four starts, recording 20 tackles, one interception, a career-high ten passes defensed and six coverage stops to rank second on the team, tying his career-high.

On the following pages are a synopsis of several returning players and newcomers through the draft and free agency to the 2023 Saints offensive line:

**Right Tackle Ryan Ramczyk** - The Black and Gold used their second first round selection in the 2017 NFL Draft to snag Ramczyk out of Wisconsin, one of the best offensive linemen in the entire draft. After opening all 16 games and both postseason contests in 2017 and being selected as a PFWA All-Rookie, he has been selected as an AP All-Pro selection three times since. After missing seven contests in 2021, Ramczyk rebounded to open the first 16 games in 2022 and continues to anchor the right side of the line.

**Tackle/Guard James Hurst** - A nine-year NFL veteran who was signed as a free agent from Baltimore in 2020, Hurst has 145 career regular season appearances with 90 starts at four different positions on the inside and outside. His versatility came in handy in 2020, as he started two contests at left tackle and one at left guard, while the Saints gained over 200 yards rushing each time. In 2021, Hurst moved into the lineup for eight games at left tackle in place of an injured Armstead, two at left guard in place of an injured Andrus Peat and three at right tackle for an injured Ryan Ramczyk. Hurst started 15 games at left tackle

and one at left guard in 2022. In 2023, Hurst has opened nine games at left guard, one at left tackle and one at right guard.

**Tackle/Guard Andrus Peat** - A first round selection (13th overall) in the 2015 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Peat was considered one of the top college linemen in 2014. In nine seasons, he's played in 106 regular season games with 97 starts, opening a contest at every position except center. In 2020, he opened 13 contests at left guard as he was part of the NFC Pro squad for the third consecutive season. In 2021, he opened the first six contests, where New Orleans got off to a 4-2 start before suffering a season-ending pec-toral injury. In his return to the starting lineup in the 2022 season opener in Atlanta, New Orleans rushed for 151 yards. In back-to-back weeks, Peat was a part of rushing efforts of 200-yards plus by the club for the first time since 2020. In 2023, Peat has started one contest at left guard and the last seven at left tackle as the offensive line has solidified with his return to the starting lineup.

**Center/Guard Erik McCoy** - New Orleans traded up in the second round of the 2019 NFL Draft to select this standout from Texas A&M, who was a three-year starter, anchoring the middle of the Aggies line. In 2018, he was a team captain who paved the way for the SEC's leading rusher and in 2019 was the first Saint in franchise history to start at center in Week One, opening all 16 contests. McCoy has opened all 70 contests he has appeared in at center and signed a five-year contract extension with the team in 2022.

**Guard/Center Cesar Ruiz** - The hard-working, talented and intelligent lineman is a perfect fit for New Orleans' culture. He was selected with the 24th pick in the 2020 NFL Draft out of the University of Michigan. The three-year letterman played in 36 games in college, starting his last 31 including the final 26 at center, earning All-Big Ten in 2019. Ruiz settled in at right guard in the last 15 games, with nine starts, as well as both postseason contests. When McCoy suffered a lower leg injury in the first quarter of the 2021 opening win over Green Bay, Ruiz transitioned over to his natural position, where the Saints did not give up a sack in his four starts at center. He returned to right guard on Oct. 25 at Seattle and was the only lineman in 2021 to not miss a start. Ruiz opened 13 games at right guard and one at center in 2022 before suffering a season-ending foot injury Dec. 18, vs. Atlanta. The 46 consecutive starts for Ruiz at the time of his injury was the longest active streak for a Saint. Following an ardent rehab, Ruiz returned to the starting lineup for the season opener on September 10, the day after signing a four-year contract extension.

**Tackle Landon Young** - A mainstay at left tackle for his college career at the University of Kentucky, Young played in 49 contests with 30 starts in his college career. The Lexington, Ky. native was selected by New Orleans in the sixth round of the 2021 NFL Draft and held up to the competition in training camp to snare a roster spot. Young opened one contest at right tackle in 2021 and serves as Ramczyk's backup on the right side, also playing *jumbo tight* end. In 2022, Young showed versatility. On October 13 at Pittsburgh, he slide over to left tackle for the second half to replace Hurst (concussion) and opened this the November 20 win over the Rams at one of the league's most challenging positions. In the January 1, 2023 win at Philadelphia, Young played the final three quarters in place of Ramczyk (hip) and then started the following week's finale vs. Carolina.

**Tackle Trevor Penning** - The club's second first round draft choice (19th overall) in 2022 out of Northern Iowa, the 6-7, 322-pound Penning competed with Hurst for the starting left tackle slot in the preseason before suffering a toe injury. The Clear Lake, Iowa native brings athleticism and extensive college experience to the tackle position, where he played in 37 games with 33 starts. Activated for the second half of the season, Penning served as the club's sixth offensive lineman in jumbo packages and started the season finale at left tackle, carrying over in 2023 to see action at the position in six-of-13 contests played.

**Guard/Center Max Garcia** - The nine-year National Football League veteran was signed as a free agent at the start of training camp. This versatile lineman has played in 118 regular season games with 62 starts for New Orleans, Arizona and Denver, including opening the three contests at left guard in 2023. Originally a fourth round draft pick of Denver out of the University of Florida in 2015, who started five contests as a rookie for the Super Bowl 50 champions, Garcia has opened 46 games at right guard, 12 at left guard and four at center.

### IN THE NFL

After finishing ranked seventh in the National Football League in 2021, surrendering 318.2 net yards per game, the New Orleans defense returned to the top five again in 2022, ranking fifth, while giving up 314.8 net yards per game. New Orleans and San Francisco are the only two teams to rank in the top ten each of the last three seasons

and this marked the third time the Saints have ranked in the top ten in total defense for three straight seasons (1982-84 and 1991-93).

A third round draft pick of the Denver Broncos in 2018 out of Boston College, in addition to starting 24 of his 83 career contests on defense and posting 122 tackles, a split sack, two interceptions, 22 passes defended and one forced fumble, **Isaac Yiadom** has recorded 26 career coverage stops for five teams. Brought up to the active roster during Gray's injury, Yiadom brought a boost to the Saints coverage units with three stops, remaining an integral part of the group after Gray's return to the lineup and re-signing in the off-season. In 2023, Yiadom is ranked third on the team with six special teams tackles, tying his career-high. On Oct. 29, at Indianapolis, Yiadom downed a punt at the Colts three-yard line in the third quarter. In the Nov. 5 win over Chicago, Yiadom played a key role on a punt with the Bears starting field position at their two-yard line.

One of the club's two third round draft picks in 2020, **Zack Baun**, a former Wisconsin standout, has embraced work on the team's special teams units. He has recorded 21 tackles on coverage, one blocked field goal and 59 defensive stops, one sack, one interception and one pass defense. On Sept. 10 at Tennessee, Baun got his hands on a punt that went out of bounds one yard past the line of scrimmage, a game-changing play.

Selected in the fifth round of the 2022 NFL Draft by the Saints out of Appalachian State, LB **D'Marco Jackson** came to New Orleans as the only Football Bowl Subdivision player with more than 200 tackles and 25 stops for loss in the 2020 and 2021 seasons combined. After missing his entire rookie campaign with a hamstring injury, Jackson's hard-working and hard-hitting mentality has proven to be a good fit on the team's coverage units as he is tied second on the team with seven stops and the fumble recovery for a touchdown.

DB **Lonnie Johnson** was signed by New Orleans as an free agent in the offseason after spending his first three seasons with the Houston Texans and the 2022 campaign with the Tennessee Titans. Johnson has posted 19 career special teams stops, including five with New Orleans in 2023. On Oct. 19, at Jacksonville, Johnson had a fumble reery off a muffed punt for his first career special teams takeaway.

Signed as an undrafted free agent in 2022 out of Utah, Sewell appeared in four games on special teams as a rookie. In 2023, the sure tackler secured a spot on the team's coverage units and is fourth on the team with five stops to go with nine defensive tackles and Sunday's special teams forced fumble on a punt play.

The success of the team's coverage units have allowed New Orleans to rank first in the NFL in opponent punt return average.

## QUARTERBACKS

### DEREK CARR

• On March 6, 2023 the Saints agreed to terms with Derek Carr on a four-year contract to solidify the quarterback position. He spent the first nine seasons of his NFL career with the Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders. Originally selected in the second round (36th overall) of the 2014 NFL Draft by the Raiders out of Fresno State, the Bakersfield, Calif. native has started all 155 career regular season games he has played in, completing 3,480-of-5,378 passes (64.7 percent) for 38,102 yards with 230 touchdown passes, 106 interceptions and a 91.6 passer rating, while adding 884 rushing yards and six touchdowns. From 2014-22 as a member of the Raiders, Carr was selected to four Pro Bowl Games (2015-17, 2022) and set numerous team passing records including the franchise's career passing yardage and touchdown pass marks and single-season mark in passing yards (4,804 in 2021), as the only signal-caller in the team's history with multiple seasons reaching the 4,000 yard mark. He also holds franchise records from his Raid-

ers tenure for multiple-touchdown pass games (69), contests with a passer rating of at least 100.0 (47) and 300-yard passing performances (33).

• Since entering the league in 2014, Carr ranks second in the NFL in completions, fourth in passing yardage and seventh in passing touchdowns. He became the third quarterback in history to pass for 3,000-plus yards in each of his first nine seasons, joining Pro Football Hall of Fame signal-caller Peyton Manning and Russell Wilson. He is just the fourth player in NFL history to reach 35,000 passing yards in his first nine seasons. He has completed 299 passes of 25+ yards since he entered the league in 2014, the fourth-most in the NFL over that span. His 155 starts are the most by a quarterback since 2014.

• Carr enjoyed a successful Saints debut in the Sept. 10 win over Tennessee, when he completed 23-of-33 passes (69.7%) for 305 yards with one touchdown, one interception and a 96.1 passer rating.

• Carr helped lead New Orleans to a 20-17 victory at Carolina on Monday Night Football on Sept. 18, when in the second half, he completed a 42-yard pass to Chris Olave and a 45-yard pass to Rashid Shaheed to set up the Saints' two touchdowns.

• On Sept. 24 at Green Bay, Carr had completed 13-of-18 (72.2%) of his passes for 103 yards with an eight-yard scoring throw to TE Jimmy Graham and a 104.6 passer rating to help put New Orleans ahead 17-0 over the Packers before being forced to leave in the third quarter with a sprained AC joint injury.

• Carr was a model of efficiency in the Oct. 8 34-0 shutout of New England, completing 18-of-26 passes (69.2%) for 183 yards with two touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 114.7 passer rating, his highest as a Saint to date.

• On Oct. 15 at Houston, Carr finished 32-of-50 passing (64.0 pct.) for 353 yards, one touchdown and one interception, also carrying two yards for a first down. It was the tenth-highest passing yardage total of Carr's career and his highest total as a Saint to date.

• On Oct. 19 vs. Jacksonville, Carr completed 33-of-55 passes for 301 yards with a 17-yard touchdown to Michael Thomas, as he became the first Saints passer to have back-to-back weeks of at least 300 yards passing since Drew Brees in Weeks 14 and 15 of the 2019 campaign.

• In the Oct. 29 win at Indianapolis, Carr was in complete control, as he completed 19-of-27 passes for 310 yards with two touchdowns, including a 58-yard touchdown pass to Shaheed, one of two completions of 50-yards or more to the speedster, as he became the first Saints passer to have three consecutive weeks of at least 300 yards passing since Brees did so in four straight from Dec. 21, 2015-Sept. 11, 2016. It was also the first time Carr threw for 300 yards in three straight contests since Weeks One-Three of 2021.

• In the Nov. 5 24-17 win over Chicago, Carr completed 25-of-34 passes (73.5%) for 211 yards, two TDs and a 108.8 passer rating. Carr engineered a fourth quarter, go-ahead, game-winning drive, where he completed both passing attempts for 18 yards,.

• On Nov. 26, at Atlanta, Carr completed 24-of-38 passes for 304 yards with three completions of 25 yards or more for his fifth performance of at least 300 yards of the season.

• On Dec. 3, vs. Detroit, Carr completed 17-of-22 passes (77.3%) for 226 yards with one touchdown and a 105.5 passer rating, as he completed his final 15 attempts.

• On Dec. 10, vs. Carolina, Carr completed 18-of-26 passes for 119 yards with touchdown passes to Jimmy Graham and Chris Olave to help New Orleans to the season sweep over the Panthers.

- The 2013 Heisman Trophy winner at Florida State and the first pick in the 2015 NFL Draft, Winston has appeared

in 92 games with 80 starts, completing 1,763-of-2,882 passes (61.2%) for 22,104 yards with 141 touchdowns, 99 interceptions and an 87.0 rating, adding 1,214 rushing yards and 11 touchdowns. In 2021, before suffering a season-ending knee injury in Week Eight, Winston completed 95-of-161 passes for 1,170 yards, 14 touchdowns, three interceptions and a 102.8 passer rating, ranked first in the NFL at the time of his injury in touchdown percentage (8.7).

- Serving as the backup to Carr with extensive starting experience, Winston has completed 25-of-47 passes for 264 yards with two touchdowns and three interceptions.

### TAYSOM HILL

- Hill's brought unheralded versatility to the Saints offense and special teams. A constant participant on special teams from midseason in 2017, as well as the backup signal-caller and as a runner and receiver, Hill has played in 93 regular season games with 40 starts at several positions. He has carried 387 times for 2,104 yards, the most by a Saint not to play running back, with 27 touchdowns, tied for seventh in club records, caught 69 passes for 694 yards with ten touchdowns, completed 190-of-295 passes (64.8%) for 2,337 yards with 11 touchdowns, returned 18 punts for 429 yards, made 15 special teams tackles and one blocked punt.

- In 2022, Hill assisted the Black and Gold offense in multiple facets. He contributed on both offense and special teams in the season opener at Atlanta, Hill carried four times for a club-best 81 yards (20.3 avg.), including a career-long 57-yard carry, as well as an 11-yard rushing touchdown on the same first quarter drive of his long run. Hill also caught a pass for a two-yard gain and contributed on multiple special teams units both on the coverage and return teams. Overall, he ranked second on the team in rushing with 96 carries for a career-high 575 yards (club-best 6.0 avg.) with a club-best seven rushing touchdowns, nine catches for 75 yards with two scores, leading the team in total touchdowns, while completing 13-of-19 passes for 240 yards with two touchdown throws and a 146.3 passer rating.

- In 2023, Hill ranks second on the team in rushing with 70 carries for 346 yards (4.9 avg.) with four touchdowns to tie for the team lead, has caught a career-high 26 passes for 229 yards with one touchdown, has completed five of eight passes for 72 yards (62.5%) with one touchdown with a 131.3 passer rating and has one special teams tackle.

## RENAISSANCE MAN

Hill enjoyed an all-around standout versatile performance in the November 5 win over Chicago, when he led the team in rushing, carrying 11 times for 52 yards (4.7 avg.), completed a three-yard touchdown pass to tight end Juwan Johnson and caught four passes for 13 yards with one touchdown. With his touchdown reception from Carr, the tenth of his career, Hill became the first player since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger and the first player since quarterback/halfback Frank Gifford to have at least ten career rushing touchdowns, passing touchdowns and receiving touchdowns. Hill has 27 rushing touchdowns, 11 touchdown passes and ten touchdowns in his career and became the second player in NFL history with at least 25 rushing touchdowns, ten touchdown passes and ten touchdown receptions, joining Gifford (34 rushing touchdowns, 14 touchdown passes and 43 touchdown receptions). Given the historical element of Hill's accomplishments, the Pro Football Hall of Fame has requested several items that were worn and used by Hill in his historic performance that now stands as an exhibit to fans at the museum.

## RUNNING BACKS

### ALVIN KAMARA

- A talented runner and receiver with a 5-10, 215-pound frame who was selected by the Saints in the third round of the 2017 NFL Draft out of the University of Tennessee, Kamara enjoyed an outstanding rookie campaign. He ranked first on the club and sixth in the NFL in yards from scrimmage (1,554), second on the team in rushing and receiving, carrying 120 times for 728 yards (6.1 avg.) with eight TDs and a two-point conversion, catching 81 passes for 826 yards (10.2 avg.) with five TDs and a kickoff return for a TD for a club rookie record 14 total scores, tied for second in the NFL. Kamara finished first in the NFL in yards per carry.

- Kamara was the first Saints offensive rookie selected to the Pro Bowl since Rueben Mayes (1986), as an AP second team All-Pro (flex), the clubs' first rookie All-Pro since 1993. He was named *The Sporting News* NFL Rookie of the Year and AP NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year.

- In ten games in 2023, Kamara leads New Orleans in rushing with 145 carries for 564 yards and a club-best five touchdowns, leading NFL running backs in receiving with 63 receptions for 402 yards with one touchdown for a club-best 966 total yards from scrimmage.

## SCRIMMAGE LEADER

Since entering the National Football League in 2017, Kamara ranks third in the league in total yards from scrimmage (9,854). Kamara is the first NFL player since Julio Jones (2014-19) to have six consecutive seasons of at least 1,300 total yards from scrimmage.

## THIRD THROUGH FIVE

### JAMAAL WILLIAMS

- Signed by the Saints as an unrestricted free agent from Detroit in the offseason, Williams is a talented runner who had a breakout season in 2022, as he led the National Football League and set a Lions single-season franchise record for rushing touchdowns with 17. In 17 games with nine starts for Detroit, Williams added on 262 attempts for 1,066 rushing yards and 12 receptions for 73 yards, producing the first 1,000 yard rushing season of his career.

- The former BYU star's talent came consistently all over the field, as well as in short bursts, as ten of his rushing touchdowns in 2022 came from exactly one yard out, tied for third-most in NFL history. A sound ballcarrier, he went 752 career touches before fumbling the ball and became the league's first active running back to reach 600 carries before fumbling.

- Since being drafted by Green Bay in the fourth round (134th overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft, Williams has played in 99 games with 42 starts, totaling 978 attempts for 3,842 yards and 30 touchdowns, while adding 169 receptions for 1,225 yards and eight touchdowns against only five fumbles.

After a return to action in Week Seven, Williams overall has played in nine games with two starts and rushed for 190 yards, forming a rushing trio with Kamara and his former college teammate, Hill.

## WIDE RECEIVERS

### CHRIS OLAVE

• A talented wide receiver who became one of the most prolific receivers in Buckeyes history, Olave played in 47 games and caught 176 passes for 2,711 yards (15.4 avg.) with 35 touchdowns. Olave's 35 career touchdown receptions set an Ohio State program record and ranks fourth in Big Ten history. His 11 career 100-yard games also ranks second in school history. Olave entered the starting lineup in 2019 with immediate results. He helped lead the Buckeyes to three consecutive Big Ten championships (2018-2020) and back-to-back College Football Playoff appearances (2019, 2020). In the 2020 CFP Semifinal vs. Clemson, Olave had a career night, hauling in six passes for 132 yards and two touchdowns in a 49-28 win, securing a bid to play in the championship game. Olave seamlessly integrated into the Saints offense following a standout senior campaign, where he caught 65 passes for 936 yards (14.4 avg.) and 13 touchdowns, tied for sixth nationally, as he was selected as an AFCA first-team All-American and a consensus second-team All-American.

• Following a September, where he captured NFL Offensive Rookie of the Month honors with 17 grabs for a league rookie-best 268 yards, including scoring receiving touchdowns in back to back contests, Olave led the team in receiving, yards per catch and receiving yardage with 72 grabs for 1,042 yards (14.5 avg.) with four touchdowns along with a successful two-point conversion, ranking second among rookies in receiving yardage and tied for second in catches and third down grabs (26). Olave became the first Saints rookie since Danny Abramowicz (1967) to lead the team in receiving, receiving yardage and yards per catch in his first campaign. The receiving yardage total was second all-time among Saints rookies, as he was only the third Black and Gold rookie to reach 1,000.

Chris Olave became the 24th player since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger to record 1,000 receiving yards in his rookie season in 2022, recording 1,042.

Olave has picked up right where he left off from his rookie campaign in 2023, as he leads the team in receiving, receiving yardage and touchdown grabs with 72 receptions for 918 yards (12.8 avg.) with four touchdowns.

## TIGHT ENDS

### JUWAN JOHNSON

- The former Penn State and Oregon wideout joined the Saints in 2020 following the NFL Draft and transitioned to tight end his second season. In 2022, the New Jersey native had a breakout campaign as he appeared in 16 games with 12 starts and finished with 42 receptions for 508 yards and a team-best seven touchdown grabs. Johnson's touchdown grab total was tied for third among National Football League tight ends.

- In eight games in 2023, Johnson has 20 receptions for 152 yards with one touchdown to lead the tight end corps in receiving. After missing four contests with a calf injury, Johnson's returned to action Oct. 29 and has been an asset as a receiver and a blocker.

### FOSTER MOREAU

- This veteran tight end and New Orleans native enters his fifth National Football League season and first with the Black and Gold after spending his first four seasons with the Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders. In his career, Moreau has appeared in 72 regular season games with 41 starts and has recorded 106 receptions for 1,258 yards (12.0 avg.) with 13 touchdowns and has posted at least 30 catches in each of his last two campaigns. In 2022, the former Jesuit High School and LSU standout set career-highs in receptions (33) and receiving yards (420), while adding two touchdowns.

- Moreau got on the scoreboard for the first time as a Saint on Oct. 8 at New England with a fourth quarter six-yard grab. He has 15 grabs for 151 yards to rank second among Saints tight ends in receptions and receiving yardage, with one scoring grab.

**JIMMY GRAHAM**

• New Orleans' third round draft choice in 2010 after playing four years of basketball and just one year of football at the University of Miami (Fla.). Graham broke out in his second year with the Saints totaling 99 catches for 1,310 yards with 11 touchdowns and went on to lead the team in receiving for four consecutive seasons. Graham's production has been among the top 10 in NFL history at the tight end position in all three major categories: receptions, yards, and receiving touchdowns. Graham posts career totals of 717 receptions, 8,536 yards, and 88 touchdowns. His 88 receiving touchdowns rank 4<sup>th</sup> all time among NFL tight ends, while his 54 touchdowns as a Saint rank 2<sup>nd</sup> in franchise history. He and Kansas City's Travis Kelce are the only two tight ends in NFL history to have multiple seasons of 1,200-plus receiving yards and 10- plus receiving touchdowns. Graham returns to New Orleans, the location of his most personal and team success, after playing in seven campaigns with three other teams.

Jordan has posted 117.5 career sacks and is the only active player to have 90 takedowns and 50 passes defensed. During this time, the Saints own a 57-23 regular season record when he corrals a signal-caller, and they boast a 24-3 mark in a multi-sack performance in the regular season,

including a three-sack performance on Jan. 1, 2023 at Philadelphia that made him the franchise's all-time leader in sacks, the same opponent of his first three-sack performance in 2012. With the three-takedown performance against the Eagles, Jordan's 27 multi-sack games are tied for first in franchise record books with Pro Football Hall of Fame linebacker Rickey Jackson's 27, with both of them leading the franchise with six performances of at least three sacks.

### DEMARIO DAVIS

• This dependable and sure-tackling defender joined the New Orleans Saints in 2018 after spending his first six National Football League seasons with the New York Jets and Cleveland Browns. For his career, the Brandon, Miss. native has appeared in 188 career regular season games with 174 starts for the Jets (2012-15, 2017), Cleveland (2016) and the Saints (2018-), recording 1,305 stops (843 solo), 41.5 sacks, three interceptions, 55 passes defended, four forced fumbles, seven fumble recoveries and 24 special teams tackles. With eight stops in Sunday's win over Carolina, Davis joined Bobby Wagner and Lavonte David as only the third active NFL player with 1,300.

• In 2018, Davis opened all 16 contests and led the team with 110 stops (74 solo), five sacks to lead the linebackers, four passes defended, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. Davis' abilities to diagnose and tackle played a key role in New Orleans ranking second in the NFL in opponent rushing yards per game and opponent rushing yards per play. Participating in the postseason for the first time, Davis led the defense with 22 stops (15 solo), an interception in the NFC Championship and a pass defense.

• In 2019, he posted 111 stops, ranked first on the club, four sacks, one interception and 11 passes defended to help spur the league's fourth-ranked run defense.

### IRON MAN

Davis who had never missed a game in his career until December 27, 2021 vs. Miami due to COVID-19 protocols, ranks as one of the league's most durable defenders, while playing one of the game's most physically demanding positions. His 158 consecutive games played streak was the longest in the NFL by a position player and his 79 straight games started were the most at his position. In 2022, Davis was one of three Black and Gold starting defenders to open every contest, joining safety Tyrann Mathieu and defensive tackle David Onyemata. More impressive, he was the only linebacker in the NFL to play in every defensive snap for his teams.

#### PETE WERNER

- New Orleans selected this three-year starter from Ohio State in the second round of the 2021 NFL Draft. The Indianapolis native finished his college career playing in 47 career games with 35 starts, recording 185 tackles (111 solo), 16 stops for loss, four sacks, 11 passes defended, four forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Werner helped power the Buckeyes to the College Football Playoff championship game as a senior in 2020, when he was voted by Big Ten coaches as a first-team All-Conference selection and a Butkus Award semifinalist, posting 54 tackles, 2.5 stops for loss, one sack and two forced fumbles. Werner made his second career start Oct. 3 vs. the Giants and recorded a ten tackles. With 13 stops in Week Five at Washington, he became the first Saints rookie defender to reach double-digit totals in back-to-back games. He ranked fifth on the team with 59 tackles.

- Werner enjoyed a standout 2022 season, appearing in 12 games with 11 starts at weakside linebacker and ranked third on the team and second at the linebacker position, despite missing five games, with 79 tackles (55 solo), three stop for loss, three passes defended, two forced fumbles and one special teams tackle.

- Werner got off to an impressive start for the 2023 season, finishing second on the team with eight stops in the Sept.

10 season-opening win over Tennessee, one stop for loss and a split sack, his first career takedown. He recorded his first career interception this on October 8 in a 34-0 shutout at New England. Leading or tying for the team lead in stops in the last three contests, Werner is ranked second on the team with 69 stops, a split sack, one interception, one pass defense and two fumble recoveries, the most recent which took place in the first half of Sunday's 28-6 win over Carolina.

### SECONDARY

#### S TYRANN MATHIEU

- This versatile, hard-hitting, playmaking safety and New Orleans native returned home, signing after the draft and brings extensive experience to the secondary. Mathieu was selected by the Arizona Cardinals in the third round (69th overall) in the 2013 NFL Draft out of LSU and has played for the Cardinals (2013-17), Houston Texans (2018), Kansas City Chiefs (2019-21) and now the Saints. In 11 NFL seasons, he has played in 159 regular season games with 150 starts and has posted career totals of 752 tackles (621 solo), 42 stops for loss, ten sacks for a loss of 78 yards, 32 interceptions for 427 returns yards, four brought back for touchdowns, 97 passes defended, four forced fumbles, seven fumble recoveries and five special teams stops. Mathieu has been selected to three Pro Bowls, three Associated Press All-Pro teams and the Pro Football Hall of Fame's 2010's All-Decade Team.

### SECONDARY

Mathieu came to New Orleans after starting all 16 games he played in for Kansas City in 2021 and recording 76 tackles, one sack, a career-high three fumble recoveries, one sack and two interceptions to earn his second consecutive Pro Bowl selection. With a team-leading three picks and one fumble recovery, adding up to a team-best four takeaways to go with a career-high 91 tackles (club-best 64 solo) to rank third on the team and first in the secondary.

Mathieu's 32 picks since coming into the league in 2013 are tied for second in the National Football League after recording two picks for the fourth time in his career on November 26 at Atlanta. With three interceptions in 2023, Mathieu is second on the team.

**CB PAULSON ADEBO**

- New Orleans' third round selection (76th overall) in the 2021 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Adebo overcame not playing college football in 2020 to make significant contributions to the Saints secondary in his first season with the club. The Texas native finished his college career playing in 22 games with 21 starts for Stanford and recording 97 tackles, 34 passes defended and eight interceptions, earning All-Pac 12 honors in both 2018 and 2019.

- Adebo showed his development by opening opposite Lattimore in the 2021 regular season opening win vs. Green Bay and returning a pick 33 yards in the third quarter to become the first Saints defender to have an interception in his NFL debut since LB James Allen vs. Tampa Bay on September 8, 2002. He then added a second pick in the Week Five win at Washington. With a pick in the regular season finale at Atlanta, Adebo finished his rookie campaign ranked fifth on the club with 63 tackles (54 solo), tied for first with three picks and added eight passes defended and two special teams stops.

- Adebo fought off injuries in 2022 and played in 13 games with 12 starts to lead the team's corners with 60 tackles (51 solo) and added seven passes defended for the NFL's second-ranked club in opponent passing yards per game.

- Sharpened by an extensive training camp competition, Adebo is enjoying a standout campaign despite missing two contests with a hamstring injury. Following a two interception, three total takeaway performance in The November 5 24-17 win over Chicago that earned him NFC Defensive Player of the Week, Adebo has 48 tackles, four interceptions, 14 passes defended, two forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Adebo's four interceptions are tied for fourth in the NFL, while his six total takeaways are tied for second in the league with Baltimore Ravens S Geno Stone and Buffalo CB Rasul Douglas. His team-leading pass defense total for the team leading the NFL in passes defended is tied for fifth in the league.

**CB ALONTAE TAYLOR**

- Selected by the Saints in the second round (49<sup>th</sup> overall) of the 2022 NFL Draft out of Tennessee, Taylor shook off early injuries to play in 13 games with nine starts and posted 45 tackles (38 solo) and a club-best 11 passes defended.

- Moving to the nickel position in 2023, Taylor has 58 tack-

les and a career-high 12 passes defended playing in the nickel, ranked second on the team and ninth in the NFL.

**NEW ORLEANS SAINTS VS CAROLINA PANTHERS**  
**SUNDAY, DECEMBER 10, 2023 • CAESARS SUPERDOME**  
**SAINTS POSTGAME NOTES**

- The New Orleans Saints were victorious over the Carolina Panthers by a score of 28-6.
- With the win, the Saints are now 6-7 overall in a three-way tie for first place in the NFC South with Atlanta and Tampa Bay. New Orleans returns to action on Sunday, December 17, when it hosts the New York Giants. Kickoff at noon central time and the game will be regionally televised on FOX (WVUE-FOX 8 locally).
- The Saints improved their home record in 2023 to 3-3.
- With the Saints win, they improved their regular season record against Carolina to 30-28, 31-28, including a 2017 NFC Wild Card Playoff victory. It gave them their first season sweep of the Panthers since 2020 and eighth overall.
- While the Panthers offense was eight-of-20 (40.0%) on third down, the Saints allowed Carolina to convert only one-of-seven fourth down attempts (14.3%).
- The Saints never trailed the Panthers on the afternoon. This was the third contest where New Orleans kept an opponent out of the end zone in 2023, third time in four seasons this has happened (2020-2021, 2023). Only the Saints, Cleveland Browns and Baltimore Ravens, have not given a touchdown in three contests this season.
- The Black and Gold forced three fumbles on the day, with two recovered, one of them returned for a touchdown. They also had an outstanding showing in the first half, giving up only 16 net passing yards in the first half.
- The New Orleans offensive line gave up only one sack, having given up one or fewer takedowns in four straight games.
- QB **Derek Carr** completed 18-of-26 passes for 119 yards with two touchdowns, one interception and a 88.5 passer rating. Carr also recorded his first series sweep as a starter with New Orleans and is 4-0 against Carolina as a starter.
- RB **Alvin Kamara** moved into a tie for 74th in career touchdowns (78) with RBs Eddie George and Steven Jackson and RB/QB Frank Gifford and a tie for 67<sup>th</sup> in rushing touchdowns (54) with RBs Matt Forte, Arian Foster and former Saints George Rogers and Antowain Smith. Kamara finished the afternoon with 56 rushing yards and the rushing score.
- He also tallied three receptions on the day, which moves him ahead of Walter Payton on the career catches list (493).
- TE **Jimmy Graham** caught his 88<sup>th</sup> career touchdown, a four-yard grab, moving into a tie for 16<sup>th</sup> with former New York Jets WR Don Maynard. Including a 12-yard reception for a first down, he had two grabs for 16 yards.
- WR **Chris Olave** tallied 28 yards on four catches with one touchdown catch. With a club-best 918 receiving yards on the season, Olave is 82 receiving yards from joining WRs Marques Colston (2006-07) and Michael Thomas (2016-17) as only the third Saint to open his career with back-to-back 1,000-yard receiving campaigns.
- WR **A.T. Perry** had a career-long 44-yard reception in the fourth quarter.
- WR **Lynn Bowden Jr.** caught four passes for 24 yards, returned two punts for 23 yards and brought back a kickoff for a career-long 28 yards.
- With the rushing attack of Kamara and RB **Jamaal Williams**, the Saints reached 100,000 rushing yards as a franchise. Williams finished with 11 carries for 43 yards.
- SS **Jordan Howden** was the leading tackler, with a career-high ten stops (team-best eight solo), while also recording a sack and a forced fumble.
- LB **D'Marco Jackson** had his first career fumble recovery and touchdown on a fourth down play, where LB **Nephi Sewell** forced Panthers P **Johnny Hekker** to fumble prior to him getting a punt off. Jackson also added one special teams stop.
- LB **Demario Davis** tallied 1.5 sacks and eight tackles to join Seattle LB Bobby Wagner and Tampa Bay LB Lavonte David among active players with 1,300 career tackles (1,305), also adding one pass defense. Davis has 5.5 takedowns on the season, ranked second on the team.
- S **Tyrann Mathieu** started his 150th game against the Panthers, and he reached 750 tackles with his five stops.

- LS **Zach Wood** played in his 111<sup>th</sup> career game, moving past P Tommy Barnhardt for sole possession of 36<sup>th</sup> on the club's games played list.
- DE **Carl Granderson** set a new career high in sacks with 6.5 as he took down Panthers QB Bryce Young. He also recorded five tackles (four solo) in the contest.
- CB **Isaac Yiadom** got the start and finished with two tackles (one solo) and a club-best three passes defended.
- LB **Pete Werner** finished with two solo tackles and one fumble recovery.
- CB **Alontae Taylor** finished with six tackles (three solo), two passes defended and one forced fumble.
- As part of a five solo tackle day, CB **Paulson Adebo** made a heads up play, running down Panthers RB **Miles Sanders** on a 48-yard run at the New Orleans one-yard line, to prevent Carolina from reaching the end zone.

## POSTGAME NOTES AND QUOTES

### CAROLINA PANTHERS VS. NEW ORLEANS SAINTS SUNDAY, DECEMBER 10, 2023 • CAESARS SUPERDOME NEW ORLEANS SAINTS HEAD COACH DENNIS ALLEN

(Opening statement) “Obviously it feels good to win, particularly here at home. I don’t think that we played as well as we need to play. We played well enough to win this game, but we certainly need to play better, particularly on offense. I don’t think we played the way we need to play offensively. I thought the blocked punt (note NFL later changed scoring of the play to a forced fumble/fumble recovery) was a big play in the game. Defensively, we came up with a couple of red zone stops that I thought were big in the game. Our ability to finish in the red zone today was the deciding factor. I think we were 3-of-4 in the red area today. We finished drives and scored touchdowns down there. There are some positive things, but obviously, there are a lot of things we need to fix.”

(On the negatives in the offensive performance) “I did not think that we really had hardly any rhythm early on. Well, I shouldn’t say that. I thought early on in the first quarter, I thought we did a good job on the opening drive being able to run the football. We were converting early. We stalled in the red zone, and then, we missed a field goal. Then, I think, for probably a significant portion of the game, I didn’t think we had great rhythm offensively. I thought our guys in the fourth quarter responded, got a big play to A.T. (Perry). We scored down there in the red area. We had a fourth down stop basically down there in our red zone and hit another touchdown to kind of finish off the game.”

(On the exchange between QB Derek Carr and C Erik McCoy) “Look, this is a highly competitive business that we’re in. I don’t think anybody gets too sensitive. Guys want to win. That’s really what this is all about. We addressed it. As far as I’m concerned, it’s water under the bridge. Let’s move on. You know what I mean? Let’s move on.”

(On the exchange being between two captains) “I think if you’re ever in a highly competitive environment and things aren’t going the way you want them to go, yeah there are sometimes that you get frustrated. You lash out a little bit. I’m glad that both of them have the balls to at least stand up and fight. You know what I mean? This isn’t like a – hell, my wife and I argue. It happens. Let’s not make too much of it.”

(On if he’s seen this type of exchange between teammates in-game) “These kinds of things happen on the field. They happen on our sideline. They happen on our opponent’s sideline. They happen in other NFL games. I wouldn’t read too much into it. That’s two highly competitive guys. I just think when you have competitive guys and things aren’t going the way it needs to go, guys get pissed. Sometimes they express their emotions. You get over it on the sideline. You calm down, and then you come back out, you regroup and you go. That’s what we did.”

(On the exchange and the fan interaction) “Listen, stop. Stop. We’re making way too big of deal of it. Let’s move on.”

(On Derek Carr’s performance today) “Up and down. Much like the whole offense- up and down. There were some good things. There are some things that we need to do better at. That’s how I would assess it.”

(On if Carr’s injuries required the offense to play more conservatively) “I don’t really think so. I just think we struggled to kind of get into a rhythm. I do not think our execution was where it needed to be. I did think we ran the ball well early on. Obviously, we weren’t really able to throw the ball as well as we needed to. Then, we began to get a little more loaded boxes and things like that that made it a little more difficult to run the football. When we needed to go make a play to try to end the game, we made the play to end the game. I thought that was a positive.”

(On the hustle play by CB Paulson Adebo) “I thought it was awesome. I think it’s something we talk about all the time. Defend every blade of grass. (Paulson Adebo) could have easily just allowed him to go into our end zone without having to pay the price. He hustled down there, stopped him short, and then, we were able to get a red zone stop. That’s part of the culture of a winning team, and I thought that was exactly what we’re looking for.”

(On the NFC South standings and the Saints’ play) “Obviously, I feel like we need to play a better brand of football. That’s what we’re going to continue to work toward doing. We talked about winning this week, and we took care of goal No. 1. Now, we will move forward and worry about next week.”

(On TE Jimmy Graham’s third down catch) “I thought that was a hell of a catch. For (Graham) to go up there like that and bring it in through contact is something we (have) missed a little bit and was nice to see.”

(On the Saints' defensive performance today) "I thought, particularly in the passing game, we did a good job. I feel like there were some opportunities to get the quarterback (Bryce Young) on the ground, and we did not. They ended up converting a few more first downs via (Young)'s legs than I would have liked. Then, we had one miss on a run that ended up being an explosive run. I thought, overall, they did some nice things. I feel like once we got them into a passing game mode, our guys took advantage of it."

(On Graham performing well after being inactive early in the season) "Again, let's start focusing on what we need to do moving forward. I think we've all been through those decisions and thought through all those things. (Graham)'s certainly given us a little bit of an uptick the last couple weeks."

(On the design of the play that resulted in a Saints touchdown by D'Marco Jackson): "Honestly, I'm not sure exactly how it got through. I know Nephi (Sewell) got through pretty clean and did a heck of a job taking the ball off the foot, and then D. Jack was there to pick it up and run it in. Obviously, the design of the rush was good, and the execution of the rush was good."

(On the message to the team after the win) "Every game you play whether you win or lose, there's going to be good things that happen in the game. There's going to be some bad things that happens in the game. There has never been a game where that has not been the case. Ultimately, this game is about winning. We won a game today. Nobody is going to apologize for winning a game today. We're going to take the win. We are going to understand the corrections we need to make, and we are going to work hard to correct those things. That is the process you go through on a daily and a weekly basis."

(On Zack Baun's expanded pass rush role recently) "It is hard for me to comment on that right now, but certainly, that has been something we've kind of needed, maybe a little bit more speed on the edge, especially with Cam (Jordan) being kind of limited. We'll evaluate the tape and see how it was. I would expect you could continue to see (Zack Baun) in that role."

(On WR Chris Olave playing through illness) "Oh yeah, (Chris) was battling through it, but he fought through it. It was a hell of a play on the goal line to catch the ball for the touchdown. It was good, but yeah, he was not feeling well."

(On Graham's response after being inactive early in the season) "Great, great. (Jimmy) responded great when he got in the lineup. He's a pro. He said he would be ready when his number was called. His number was called, and he was ready. That was good."

(On S Jordan Howden's performance) "Just on first take after just coming off the field, I thought there were some good things (Howden) did in the game. I think there are some things we are going to need to correct. I probably can't give too much detail as to exactly how I think he played because it is kind of hard to do when you just come off the field, but I saw some plays that he impacted the game. I saw some plays that I felt like we need to do better there."

(On Carr coming off the injuries last week) "Up and down. I said (Derek) played up and down a little like the rest of the offense. It wasn't his best performance, but again, we won the game. We will make whatever corrections we need to make, and we will move forward."

(On the early focus of the run game) "We felt like this is a really good pass defense. I think they were sixth in the league in terms of pass defense coming into the game. We knew that was going to be a difficult challenge, yet felt like there were some opportunities to potentially run the ball against them. I thought our regular running game was much better in this game, particularly with us not having Taysom (Hill) available to us. We knew that was going to be something we were going to have to do a good job of – just hand the ball off to the runners and let them get yards. We did a pretty decent job of that."

(On the crowd and the Saints' need to win): "Look, I think everybody in that locker room and everybody in the city of New Orleans needed the Saints to win. I was glad we were able to do that."

(On the defensive front four): "Why don't you let me look at the tape before I can really comment on exactly what I thought? I did think we got after the quarterback more in this game than we have in previous games. That did kind of stand out to me a little bit."



## POSTGAME NOTES AND QUOTES

### CAROLINA PANTHERS VS. NEW ORLEANS SAINTS SUNDAY, DECEMBER 10, 2023 • CAESARS SUPERDOME CAROLINA PANTHERS INTERIM HEAD COACH CHRIS TABOR

(Opening comments) "I will first start off with the injuries. #67 had a calf strain (and) did not return. #80, Ian Thomas, had an ankle (and) did not return. Those are the two injuries right there. Obviously, I'm going to tip my hat to New Orleans. We didn't play enough complementary football today. (We) had our chances and didn't capitalize. Then, we shot ourselves in the foot and had catastrophic mistakes, so we have to regroup. We are going to regroup and come back."

(On what he saw on the fumble returned for a touchdown for the Saints) "It was a blocked punt. Man didn't go out and block the guy he was supposed to. That's a mistake that, obviously, cannot happen."

(On the turnover being ruled as a fumble) "It's a blocked punt; they scored off of it. However people want to score it in fantasy football, it doesn't matter to me. We made a mistake and didn't do our job. That hurt us there. I thought that our defense played outstanding to keep us in things. There in the fourth quarter, we had an opportunity to go down and tie it, and we didn't."

(On the reasons why the team has not been able to get ahead in close games this year) "Because we haven't won yet. We need to figure out how to win. That's what we got to get done. And you have to keep chopping wood and keep going in order to break through. It's just not going to magically happen for you. When your number is called, you've got to make a play. You never know in this game when it is going to happen."

(On if Bryce Young is able to get anything out of the game when the team is struggling like this) "Absolutely. I think that he is going to continue to improve. That doesn't concern me at all. We ran the ball for 200 yards today. I know that you are going right there at the (offensive) line, but we ran the ball for 200 yards. Somebody is blocking him."

(On if it is frustrating to have that kind of output and not win) "Everything is frustrating right now, if I have to be completely honest. As I said, (it's) how you are going to handle it. It's tough after this loss, but we've got to keep going."

(On not taking shots down the field and being aggressive) "We took shots today, a lot of shots. Obviously, we didn't connect on enough that we wanted. Then, unfortunately, we didn't get any PI calls or anything along those lines. It's a good secondary. It's a really good secondary. We had chances there and we didn't capitalize. We have to continue to work on getting that better."

(On why the passing game is a struggle) "I do not know that answer, because if we had the answer, we would have already fixed it. I think that it is just something that we have to continue to work on. When you pitch and catch, we have to pitch and catch. We had opportunities. Whether a guy is open or not, put it on him. When a guy is open, catch the ball. There are a lot of things...everyone has a job and a responsibility. We just need guys to work hard and continue to do their job."

(On his frustration) "I don't like to lose. I don't care what the circumstances are. I don't like to lose."

#### TE JIMMY GRAHAM

(On how he approached being inactive for a while this season) “For me, it was a little different obviously, you know. I want to be in that jersey for the city and for this team you know, but it just didn't work out. I kind of knew my role coming in, that it was going to be limited and I needed to stay ready for the opportunity. So, I did a lot of biking and just made sure I was just mentally ready for it so I could rise up and make a play.”

(On his third down touchdown catch) “Yeah, well, I kind of wasn't supposed to be there. But yea, I got rerouted and, you know, I mean, it just felt like a normal drill where he [Derek Carr] just trusts me and just threw it up. It felt like the clock ticked back about a decade. And after that, I kind of lose it and start screaming and going to the sideline to hype up people. So, those moments are special. I have to say, that is the one thing that you can't replace whenever you leave this game. You know, the feeling of moments like that, when the crowd goes crazy. And when your teammates are on the sideline and you're able to celebrate with them. You know, that is what (I) came back (for), and these are moments I live for. And so, to be able to do that here, you know, I'll never get tired of it.”

(On last week's first touchdown catch for the Saints in the Caesars Superdome in the regular season in a long time) “If you think about it, I spent a year away from the game. I ended up moving on to a sailboat, and just always felt like there was something missing. There is nothing like this sport in this city and for this team and in this jersey. It was magical and hopefully we get a lot more. I'm blessed to be able to play this game at 37. I feel like I've been kind of an underdog most of my life, so every play I get out there, I play with a chip on my shoulder. And I am always trying to prove people wrong. Today, I had to throw the walker to the side to make a couple plays, but, it's magical.”

(On team being in a three-way tie for first place in the NFC South): “We feel very fortunate. We are going to take it one game at a time though. We will heal up, get the gameplan, and focus on going 1-0 every week.”

#### QB DEREK CARR

(On how happy he is seeing Jimmy Graham being very productive) “Our lockers are separated by one so we have had a lot of great conversations. We're both in there (in the building mornings) very early from training camp to now and it's just great to get to know each other, to become good friends and good teammates. We knew that he could do some of these things. Obviously, we hit him early in Green Bay. And now the past couple of weeks, he's been a viable option for us. To see him still play at that level and still be able to execute at that level at his age. As you get older, you have to change certain ways that you do things, and he knows what he's doing. It's paying off for him because he's still executing at a high level. He made the best play with that catch you know, it's unbelievable. It is like, the only place I could throw it. And it's Jimmy Graham. You watch that play and you're like, he looks like he's 28 years old, you know. I was really impressed. But I think the greatest thing is his leadership, you know what he brings to our team. Just the mellowness and his demeanor when it's tough, when it's hard, those grinding days on Wednesday or Thursday. He has been just fantastic for our team.”

(On the altercation between himself and C/G Erik McCoy) “I mean, things happen and we were both had our reasons. We were both right for an aspect, we're both wrong for an aspect. But that's not the only time that's ever happened with me and another player you know. That stuff happens. The best part about it, I was always taught that those moments are going to happen. You're going to have conflict and sometimes confrontation. But always circle back. So, I went and circled back. We looked at each other and we smiled. We both already knew. I know it looks more intense with all the cameras around that gets caught sometimes. But there is no problem.”

(On how he played) “We got the win! I'm just excited we won the game today. People gritted through some stuff this week and to see them happy and dancing after a win, that's what I'm happy about.”

## **DE CARL GRANDERSON**

(On how the defense played) “We started off fast. We got a quick three and out on defense and gave our offense opportunities. We came out ready to play.”

(On how he continues to play well after receiving a big contract) “I've come a long way. I started from the bottom and worked my way up with effort and energy and execution. I started off on special teams and now I'm a starting defensive end, so I came a long way. I put up hard work and dedication every day I come to work, and I play for my teammates.”

(On the defensive mindset today after two uncharacteristic games) “We know overall, we're a better defense so, going into each game our objective's to stop the run so we can get after the quarterback. And that's what we did today. He [Bryce Young] may have had a few rushing yards, but we were getting after him. So, moving forward, we got to stop the run. Everybody is going to come in with a game plan. We just got to execute better than them.”

(On the approach to the game trying to connect downfield in the passing game today) “You just want to be aggressive. It is kind of a reaction, a little bit, how they are playing us too. We want to be able to take what the defense gives. So we always want to have an aggressive mindset and TB (Thomas Brown) did a great job of drawing up some shots, a great job on the outside of winning given opportunities, I have to do a better job of executing.”

Ultimately, I'm super grateful for that trust. It gives us the best chance at explosive... it gives us the best chance that's coach (Chris) Tabor and TB instilling trust in us as a unit.
