THE MATCHUP

The New Orleans Saints (3-4), will play another hungry team that has lost their last two contests, when they travel to Indianapolis to face the Colts (3-4) on Sunday at Lucas Oil Stadium. Kickoff is 12:00 p.m. Despite losing their last two, both by seven points, New Orleans sits behind Atlanta (4-3) and Tampa Bay (3-3) in a tightly contested NFC South race. Indianapolis is trying to break their losing streak after losing rookie QB **Anthony Richardson** to a shoulder injury in a Week Five win over the Tennessee Titans.

Last Thursday night at the Caesars Superdome, New Orleans rebounded from a 24-9 third quarter deficit to Jacksonville to tie the score at 24-24 in the fourth quarter, before dropping a 31-24 heartbreaker. Jaguars WR **Christian Kirk**'s fourth quarter 44-yard touchdown reception from third-year QB **Trevor Lawrence** was the difference, as New Orleans was unable to reach the end zone late in the fourth quarter despite reaching the Jacksonville six-yard line. In the first half, Jacksonville produced a pair of rushing touchdowns from RB **Travis Etienne** in the first half, including a 17-yard run early in the second quarter to give the Jaguars a 14-6 lead that turned into a 17-9 halftime edge after traded field goals. In the second half, Jacksonville jumped out to a 24-9 third quarter lead after a 24-yard

Foyesade Oluokun interception return, but Saints QB **Derek Carr** engineered a 16-play, 75-yard drive that ended with a one-yard rushing touchdown by QB **Taysom Hill** early in the fourth quarter. After the teams traded punts, New Orleans DT **Nathan Shepherd** stopped Etienne for no gain on a fourth and one situation and the Saints answered with a three-play, 53-yard drive that ended with a 17-yard touchdown pass from Carr to WR **Michael Thomas** followed by a successful two-point conversion reception by RB **Alvin Kamara** to tie the score with 3:08 left in the contest. Kamara set a club record with his fifth career two-point conversion and had 153 total yards from scrimmage.

The Saints and the Colts have met 13 times in the regular season with New Orleans holding an 8-5 edge. The clubs also faced off in Super Bowl XLIV, where New Orleans came away with a 31-17 win on Feb. 7, 2010. Since the Colts franchise departed Baltimore, the Saints have posted a 3-1 record in contests played in Indianapolis.

This Week In The NFC South: The Tampa Bay Buccaneers (3-3) will play at the Buffalo Bills (4-3) on Thursday Night Football at 7:15 p.m. CT, the Atlanta Falcons (4-3) play at the Tennessee Titans (2-4) on Sunday at Nissan Stadium at noon CT, while the Carolina Panthers (0-6) will host the Houston Texans (3-3) on Sunday at Bank of America Stadium at noon CT.

THE COACHES

Dennis Allen was hired as the 17th head coach in New Orleans Saints history on February 8, 2022. Now in his 28th year coaching and 21st in the NFL, Allen has spent 13 seasons in New Orleans in two separate stints, including the six-and-a-half campaigns (2015-21) as the team's defensive coordinator prior to being promoted to head coach. He succeeded Sean Payton, who coached the team for 16 seasons, including the 2009 campaign, when Allen was secondary coach and ended with the Super Bowl XLIV championship. When Allen took control of a Black and Gold defense in Week 11 of the 2015 season that was ranked 32nd both in opponent net yards per game and opponent points per game, he methodically molded a unit that has finished in the top 10 in both categories each of the last three years. From 2017 to the present, New Orleans is the only defense in the NFL to rank in the top five in the National Football League in both opponent rushing yards per game and sacks.

In his first year as head coach of the Saints, Allen guided New Orleans through the challenge of significant injuries at several positions to win three of their last four games after a Week 14 bye and give up 20 or fewer points in the final eight contests of the season, ten points apiece in the final three.

Carrying over to the 2023 season, a stingy Saints defense is ranked fourth in the NFL in opponent net yards per game and seventh in the league in opponent points per game.

Before rejoining the Saints coaching staff in 2015, Allen served as head coach of the Oakland Raiders from 2012-14 and as defensive coordinator of the Denver Broncos in 2011. Prior to his first stint in New Orleans from 2006-10, Allen was also an assistant with the Atlanta Falcons from 2002-05, where he received his NFL coaching start.

Over the course of his coaching career in New Orleans, Allen has coached linebacker Demario Davis and defensive end Cameron Jordan to career seasons. Davis has led the team in tackles in every campaign since signing with the club as an unrestricted free agent in 2018 and has garnered AP All-Pro honors four straight times. Since Allen returned to New Orleans in 2015, his 87.5 sacks rank third in the NFL.

Allen played safety at Texas A&M from 1992-95, where he started the final 21 games of his college career before being signed as an undrafted free agent by the Buffalo Bills in 1996. Prior to entering the National Football League coaching ranks in 2002, Allen served as a graduate assistant at his alma mater from 1996-99 and as secondary coach at the University of Tulsa from 2000-2001. He earned a bachelor of business administration degree and a master's in kinesiology from Texas A&M.

Raised in Hurst, Texas, Allen and his wife, Alisson, have a daughter, Layla and a son, Garrison.

Shane Steichen was hired as head coach of the Indianapolis Colts on Feb. 14, 2023. He has 13 years of coaching experience, including the last 12 seasons in the NFL. Steichen served as the offensive coordinator of the Philadelphia Eagles the last two seasons and helped the team reach Super Bowl LVII in 2022.

During his two seasons as Eagles offensive coordinator, Steichen coordinated an offense that ranked first in the NFL in rushing yards per game (153.6), rushing yards (5,224) and rushing touchdowns (57) over that time frame. Philadelphia also tied for first in fewest interceptions (19) and third in fourth-down conversion percentage (58.92). Additionally the Eagles offense set single-season franchise records in third-down conversion percentage in back-to-back seasons.

In 2022, Steichen guided a Philadelphia offense that finished in the top 10 in numerous categories, including, including yards per game (389.1-third), points per game (28.1-third), rushing yards per game (147.6-fifth), passing yards per game (241.5-ninth), fewest turnovers (19-tied – fifth), first downs per game (22.6-third), third down percentage (franchise-record 45.95-fourth), fourth-down percentage (68.75-fourth), red zone percentage (67.80-third), goal-to-go percentage (82.35-fifth), points scored on their first offensive possession (62-fifth) and plays of 10+ yards (253-second). The Eagles were one of just two teams to finish in the top 10 in rushing yards per game and passing yards per game. Philadelphia led the NFL eight total Pro Bowl selections, including six on offense and four offensive AP All-Pro selections.

In his first season with the Eagles, Steichen orchestrated the NFL's most productive rushing offense, as Philadelphia led the league with a franchise-record 2,715 rushing yards.

Prior to Philadelphia, Steichen spent seven seasons (2014-20) with the Los Angeles/San Diego Chargers where he served as offensive coordinator (2020), interim offensive coordinator (2019), quarterbacks coach (2016-18) and offensive quality control/wide receivers (2014-15). The Chargers offense finished in the top 10 in passing yards per game in each of his seven years on the offensive staff, including the league's best in 2017.

In 2013, Steichen assisted the quarterbacks as an offensive quality control coach with the Cleveland Browns. He began his NFL career as a defensive assistant with the Chargers (2011-12) after spending one season as a full-time offensive assistant at Louisville (2010). Steichen also served as an offensive graduate assistant (2008-09) and student graduate assistant (2007) at his alma mater, Nevada-Las Vegas.

A four-year letterman (2003-06) at Nevada-Las Vegas, Steichen left as the school's 12th all-time leading passer with 2,755 yards and 22 touchdowns. He also registered 399 rushing yards and five touchdowns.

A Native of Sacramento, Calif., Steichen was born on May 11, 1985. He and his wife, Nina, have a son and a daughter, Stella.

SERIES HISTORY

The Saints lead the all-time series with the Indianapolis Colts, 8-5 in the regular season, while also picking up the 31-17 victory in Super Bowl XLIV. The two clubs first played in New Orleans' inaugural season in 1967, when the Colts were still based in Baltimore. The last 11 contests have taken place since the Colts relocated to Indianapolis in 1984. Of the 13 regular season contests between the two clubs, five have been decided by six points or less, with New Orleans winning four including escaping Lucas Oil Field Stadium with a 27-21 win on October 25, 2015. The Saints' longest winning streak in the series was a five-game stretch from 1986-2001. Including the Super Bowl XLIV victory, the Saints have won the last four contests, the last being the 2019 win, a 34-7 Monday night victory.

Passing Game Coordinator/Quarterbacks Coach **Ronald Curry** - A seventh round draft pick (235th overall) of the Oakland Raiders in 2002 out of the University of North Carolina and played for Oakland from 2002-08, appearing in 76 games with 32 starts, registering 193 receptions for 2,347 yards with 13 TDs.

Assistant Offensive Line Coach **Kevin Carberry** - Prior to entering the coaching ranks, Carberry competed in training camps of the Cleveland Browns (2005) and Carolina Panthers (2006) and spent the 2005 season on the Detroit Lions practice squad. He also played for the Berlin Thunder of NFL Europe in the spring of 2006. From 2007-08, he played in the Arena Football League for the New York Dragons and Philadelphia Soul and was a member of the Soul's 2008 Arena Bowl Championship squad.

Offensive Assistant **Jahri Evans** - Evans was selected by the Saints in the fourth round (108th overall) of the 2006 NFL Draft and spent the first 11 seasons of his 12-year playing career with the Saints. Overall, he started 183 career regular season games at right guard for the Saints (2006-16) and Green Bay Packers (2017), 169 for the Black and Gold. Evans was a six-time Pro Bowl selection, a five-time *Associated Press* All-Pro and was named to the Pro Football Hall of Fame's 2020's All-Decade Team, as New Orleans finished in the Top Ten in total offense each of the 11 seasons he lined up for the Saints, while the 196 sacks surrendered by the offensive line over the period were the lowest in the NFC and second-lowest in the NFL. After being selected as a consensus All-Rookie in 2006, Evans was a Pro Bowl starter and consensus first-team All-Pro each season from 2009-12. He was inducted into the Saints Hall of Fame in 2020, the Louisiana Sports Hall of Fame in 2022 and was a semifinalist for the Pro Football Hall of Fame's Class of 2023.

Defensive Assistant **Matt Giordano** - Giordano was a fourth round draft pick of the Indianapolis Colts in 2005 and enjoyed a nine-year NFL career with the Colts (2005-08), Green Bay Packers (2009), Saints (2010), Oakland Raiders (2011-12) and St. Louis Rams (2013), starting 30-of-116 career games, accumulating 202 tackles, one sack, 11 interceptions, including two returned for touchdowns, 16 passes defensed, two forced fumbles, 52 special teams stop and one coverage fumble recovery. He also appeared in seven postseason games for the Colts and Packers and was a member of Indianapolis' Super Bowl XLI championship team.

BUCKING THE ODDS

The Saints have a long tradition of finding players as free agents signed after the draft that make an impact immediately or developing their careers initially on the team's practice squad. Several undrafted Saints on the roster play key roles on offense, defense and special teams that the club developed.

Wide Receiver/Return Specialist **Rashid Shaheed** came to New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Weber State in 2022 after being one of the all-time best Division FCS returners and after spending the first five weeks on the practice squad, made an immediate impact, becoming the only Saint to score a touchdown in each of his first two offensive touches. In the December 18 win over Atlanta, he finished with three receptions for 95 yards, with a 68-yard touchdown grab from Taysom Hill, the longest play from scrimmage of the season for New Orleans and the fifth-longest receiving TD by a Saints rookie all-time. On the Christmas Eve win at Cleveland in challenging conditions, Shaheed led the team in receiving with four grabs for 41 yards. In the January 1 victory at Philadelphia, he led the team in receiving for the third consecutive week, posting six receptions for 79 yards, including a 58-yard grab to set up a field goal. TE **Juwan Johnson** led his position group with four touchdown receptions in 2021, converting to the position after playing wide receiver in college and starting his Black and Gold career in 2020 as a wideout on the team's practice squad after signing as an undrafted free agent from Oregon. In 2022, he led his position group in receiving with 42 grabs for 508 yards with a club-best and career-high seven receiving touchdowns, tied for third at the position in the National Football League. On January 1, 2023 at Philadelphia, Johnson tied his career-high in receiving with five grabs for 62 yards. Missing four contests (calf), Johnson has seven grabs for 61 yards and his anticipated return will be a boost to the position group.

Defensive end **Carl Granderson** played in 15 games in 2021 with three starts and posted 24 tackles and three sacks. Kicker **Blake Grupe** was signed by New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Notre Dame, where he played his graduate campaign in 2022, after handling kicking duties at Arkansas State from 2017-21. In 2022, he led the Fighting Irish with 91 points on 14-of-19 field goals and a perfect 49-for-49 in PATs. The Missouri native was Arkansas State's career record holder in scoring (354), field goals (64) and PATs (162). In the 2023 preseason, Grupe secured a roster spot, by making five-of-six field goal attempts.

In the team's first seven games, Grupe has made 16 of 20 field goal attempts and all 11 PAT attempts to lead the team with 59 points, with 31 touchbacks on kickoffs.

Grupe enjoyed a standout performance in the Oct. 8 34-0 shutout with a career-long 54-yard field goal and a 53-yarder and hitting all four PATs to go with five of his seven kickoffs sailing into the end zone for touchbacks. Grupe became the first Saint to boot two field goals of at least 50 yards in a contest since John Carney (at StL, 9/26/04), only the fifth Saint to do so overall and only the sixth occurrence. He earned NFC Special Teams Player of the Week.

Wide Receiver **Keith Kirkwood** originally joined the Saints as an undrafted free agent out of Temple in 2018. The New Jersey native spent the first two months of his rookie season on the New Orleans practice squad, before being signed to the active roster at midseason and recording 13 receptions for 209 yards (16.1 avg.) with two touchdowns. He added one more scoring grab in the NFC Divisional playoff win over Philadelphia to help the Saints advance to the NFC Championship. After spending most of the 2019 campaign on Injured Reserve and playing for Carolina from 2020-21, Kirkwood returned to New Orleans in 2022, where he contributed on offense and special teams. PRACTICE MAKES PERFECT

A spot on the practice squad is another avenue to eventually get onto the active roster and have the opportunity to contribute. Below is an overview of eight key contributors players on the club's 53-man roster with extensive practice squad experience.

TE **Juwan Johnson** was signed by New Orleans out of Oregon, where he spent his graduate transfer season, following the 2020 NFL Draft as a wideout. Recording four receptions for 39 yards in seven contests, Johnson spent the majority of his rookie season on the practice squad. Converted to tight end in 2021 and leading the position group with four touchdowns, Johnson took advantage of his first full offseason strength and conditioning program in 2022, led the tight ends group with 42 receptions for 508 yards with a club-best seven TD grabs, tied for third in the league at his position.

After spending his first three seasons with the Seattle Seahawks, contributing on both defense and special teams, DB **Ugo Amadi** split the 2022 campaign between the Titans active roster and the Kansas City Chiefs practice squad, also appearing in one contest for Kansas City. Possessing the versatility to play in multiple roles, Amadi secured a roster spot with the Saints in the preseason, recording eight tackles, one interception, two passes defended and one coverage stop. He has contributed on both defense with one tackle and on special teams in all seven games.

After splitting his rookie season in 2018 between the practice squad and active roster, DB **J.T. Gray** enjoyed a breakthrough campaign in 2019, when he was selected AP second-team All-Pro when he recorded 16 special teams tackles, one blocked punt and one coverage fumble recovery. In 2021, he was selected as a first-team All-Pro and to his first career Pro Bowl (starter), when he led the NFL with 19 special teams tackles (league-leading 16 solo). Gray led the team with 12 special teams stops in 2022, despite missing three games with a hamstring, the third time in four seasons, he has led New Orleans in coverage tackles. He has three stops in 2023.

WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed** came to New Orleans as one of the all-time best Division I-AA returners and after spending the first five weeks on the practice squad, made a quick impact on Oct. 16 vs. Cincinnati with a 44-yard rushing TD. With his 53-yard receiving touchdown on October 20 at Arizona, Shaheed became the only Saint to score touchdowns on each of his first two career offensive touches. In addition to finishing with 28 grabs for 488 yards (17.4 avg.) with two touchdowns, Shaheed also handled return duties

for New Orleans since being activated, bringing back 20 punts for 193 yards (9.7 avg.). He made big contributions in the Sept. 10 season opening win over Tennessee with a career-high 216 all-purpose yards, including five receptions for 89 yards, including a 19-yard touchdown and a late fourth quarter 41-yard grab to help secure the victory. In the Sept. 18 win over Carolina, he posted four catches for 63 yards (15.8 avg.), including a fourth quarter 45-yard grab. On Sept. 24 at Green Bay, Shaheed had a 76-yard punt return for a touchdown.

In 2023, Shaheed has caught 20 passes for 326 yards (club-best 16.3 avg., tenth in the NFL) with a team-leading two touchdowns, including three grabs of 40-or-more yards, while also carrying six times for 33 yards and ranking second in the NFL in punt return average (18.3) and fourth all purpose yards (789).

Originally a third round draft pick of the Broncos in 2018 out of Boston College, CB **Isaac Yiadom** has played in 77 games with 21 starts for Denver, the Giants, Green Bay, Houston and New Orleans and has posted 120 tackles, a split sack, two interceptions, 19 passes defended, one forced fumble and 24 special teams stops. After starting 2022 with the Texans, Yiadom joined the Saints practice squad midway through the season and upon being signed to the active roster, recorded two special teams stops in six appearances.

In 2023, Yiadom has contributed on both defense and special teams, playing in all seven games with one start, recording 13 tackles, one interception, seven passes defended to tie for fourth in the NFL and four coverage stops to rank second on the team, only two away from his career-high.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

RT Ryan Ramczyk - The Black and Gold used their second first round selection in the 2017 NFL Draft to snag Ramczyk out of Wisconsin, one of the best offensive linemen in the entire draft. After opening all 16 games and both postseason contests in 2017 and being selected as a PFWA All-Rookie, he has been selected as an AP All-Pro selection three times since. After missing seven contests in 2021, Ramczyk rebounded to open the first 16 games in 2022 and continues to anchor the right side of the line.

T/G James Hurst - A nine-year NFL veteran who was signed as a free agent from Baltimore in 2020, Hurst has 140 career regular season appearances with 85 starts at four different positions on the inside and outside. His versatility came in handy in 2020, as he started two contests at left tackle and one at left guard, while the Saints gained over 200 yards rushing each time. In 2021, Hurst moved into the lineup for eight games at left tackle in place of an injured Armstead, two at left guard in place of an injured Andrus Peat and three at right tackle for an injured Ryan Ramczyk. Hurst started 15 games at left tackle and one at left guard in 2022. In 2023, Hurst has opened four games at left guard, one at left tackle and one at right guard.

T/G Andrus Peat - A first round selection (13th overall) in the 2015 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Peat was considered one of the top college linemen in 2014. In nine seasons, he's played in 100 regular season games with 91 starts, opening a contest at every position except center. In 2020, he opened 13 contests at left guard as he was part of the NFC Pro squad for the third consecutive season. In 2021, he opened the first six contests, where New Orleans got off to a 4-2 start before suffering a season-ending pectoral injury. In his return to the starting lineup in the 2022 season opener in Atlanta, New Orleans rushed for 151 yards. In back-to-back weeks, Peat was a part of rushing efforts of 200-yards plus by the club for the first time since 2020. In 2023, Peat has started one contest at left guard and one at left tackle.

C/G Erik McCoy - New Orleans traded up in the second round of the 2019 NFL Draft to select this standout from Texas A&M, who was a three-year starter, anchoring the middle of the Aggies line. In 2018, he was a team captain who paved the way for the SEC's leading rusher and in 2019 was the first Saint in franchise history to start at center in Week One, opening all 16 contests. McCoy has opened all 64 contests he has appeared in at center and signed a five-year contract extension with the team in 2022.

G/C Cesar Ruiz - The hard-working, talented and intelligent lineman is a perfect fit for New Orleans' culture. He was selected with the 24th pick in the 2020 NFL Draft out

of the University of Michigan. The three-year letterman played in 36 games in college, starting his last 31 including the final 26 at center, earning All-Big Ten in 2019. Ruiz settled in at right guard in the last 15 games, with nine starts, as well as both postseason contests. When McCoy suffered a lower leg injury in the first quarter of the 2021 opening win over Green Bay, Ruiz transitioned over to his natural position, where the Saints did not give up a sack in his four starts at center. He returned to right guard on Oct. 25 at Seattle and was the only lineman in 2021 to not miss a start. Ruiz opened 13 games at right guard and one at center in 2022 before suffering a season-ending foot injury Dec. 18, vs. Atlanta. The 46 consecutive starts for Ruiz at the time of his injury was the longest active streak for a Saint. Following an ardent rehab, Ruiz returned to the starting lineup for the season opener on September 10, the day after signing a four-year contract extension.

T Landon Young - A mainstay at left tackle for his college career at Kentucky, Young played in 49 contests with 30 starts in his college career. The Lexington, Ky. native was selected by New Orleans in the sixth round of the 2021 NFL Draft and held up to the competition in training camp to snare a roster spot. Young opened one contest at right tackle in 2021 and serves as Ramczyk's backup on the right side, also playing jumbo tight end. In 2022, Young showed versatility. On October 13 at Pittsburgh, he slide over to left tackle for the second half to replace Hurst (concussion) and opened this the November 20 win over the Rams at one of the league's most challenging positions. In the January 1, 2023 win at Philadelphia, Young played the final three quarters in place of Ramczyk (hip) and then started the following week's finale vs. Carolina.

T Trevor Penning - The club's second first round draft choice (19th overall) in 2022 out of Northern Iowa, the 6-7, 322-pound Penning competed with Hurst for the starting left tackle slot in the preseason before suffering a toe injury. The Clear Lake, Iowa native brings athleticism and extensive college experience to the tackle position, where he played in 37 games with 33 starts. Activated for the second half of the season, Penning served as the club's sixth offensive lineman in jumbo packages and started the season finale at left tackle, carrying over in 2023 to see action at the position in six-of-seven contests played.

G/C Max Garcia - The nine-year NFL veteran was signed as a free agent at the start of training camp. This versatile lineman has played in 112 regular season games with 61 starts for New Orleans, Arizona and Denver, including opening the last two contests at left guard. Originally a fourth round draft pick of Denver out of Florida in 2015, who started five contests as a rookie for the Super Bowl 50 champions, Garcia has opened 46 games at right guard, 11 at left guard and four at center.

IN THE NFL

After finishing ranked seventh in 2021, surrendering 318.2 net yards per game, the New Orleans defense returned to the top five again in 2022, ranking fifth, while giving up 314.8 net yards per game. New Orleans and San Francisco are the only two teams to rank in the top ten each of the last three seasons and this marked the third time the Saints have ranked in the top ten in total defense for three straight seasons (1982-84 and 1991-93).

A third round draft pick of the Denver Broncos in 2018 out of Boston College, in addition to starting 21 of his 77 career contests on defense and posting 119 tackles, a split sack, two interceptions, 19 passes defensed and a forced fumble, **Isaac Yiadom** has recorded 24 career coverage stops for five teams. Brought up to the active roster during Gray's injury, Yiadom brought a boost to the Saints coverage units with three stops, remaining an integral part of the group after Gray's return to the lineup and re-signing in the off-season. In 2023, Yiadom ranks second on the team with

four special teams tackles, only two away from his career-high.

One of the club's two third round draft picks in 2020, **Zack Baun**, a former Wisconsin standout, has embraced work on the team's special teams units. He has recorded 20 tackles on coverage, one blocked field goal and 50 defensive stops, one interception and one pass defense. On Sept. 10 at Tennessee, Baun got his hands on a punt that went out of bounds one yard past the line of scrimmage, a game-changing play.

Selected in the fifth round of the 2022 NFL Draft by the Saints out of Appalachian State, LB **D'Marco Jackson** came to New Orleans as the only Football Bowl Subdivision player with more than 200 tackles and 25 stops for loss in the 2020 and 2021 seasons combined. After missing his entire rookie campaign with a hamstring injury, Jackson's hard-working and hard-hitting mentality has proven to be a good fit on the team's coverage units as he leads New Orleans with five stops, tying a career-high with two on October 8 at New England.

DB **Lonnie Johnson** was signed by New Orleans as a free agent in the offseason after spending his first three seasons with the Houston Texans and the 2022 campaign with the Tennessee Titans. Johnson has posted 17 career special teams stops, including two with New Orleans in 2023. On Thursday night at Jacksonville, Johnson had a fumble recovery off a muffed punt for his first career special teams takeaway.

Signed as an undrafted free agent in 2022 out of Utah, Sewell appeared in four games on special teams as a rookie. In 2023, the sure tackler secured a spot on the team's coverage units and is tied for second on the team with four stops to go with one defensive tackle.

The success of the team's coverage units have allowed New Orleans to rank third in the NFL in opponent punt return average.

DEREK CARR

• On March 6, 2023 the New Orleans Saints agreed to terms with QB Derek Carr on a four-year contract to solidify the team's quarterback position. He spent the first nine seasons of his NFL career with the Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders. Originally selected in the second round (36th overall) of the 2014 NFL Draft by the Raiders out of Fresno State, the Bakersfield, Calif. native has started all 149 career regular season games he's played in, completing 3,364-of-5,213 passes (64.5 percent) for 36,822 yards with 223 touchdown passes, 103 interceptions and a 91.3 passer rating, while adding 866 rushing yards and six touchdowns. From 2014-22 as a member of the Raiders, Carr was selected to four Pro Bowl Games (2015-17, 2022) and set numerous team passing records including the franchise's career passing yardage and touchdown pass marks and single-season mark in passing yards (4,804 in 2021), as the only signal-caller in the team's history with multiple seasons reaching the 4,000 yard mark. He also holds franchise records from his Raiders tenure for multiple-touchdown pass games (69), contests with a passer rating of at least 100.0 (47) and 300-yard passing performances (33).

• Since entering the league in 2014, Carr ranks third in the NFL in completions, fourth in passing yardage and seventh in passing touchdowns. He became the third quarterback in history to pass for 3,000-plus yards in each of his first nine seasons, joining Pro Football Hall of Fame signal-caller Peyton Manning and Russell Wilson. He is just the fourth player in NFL history to reach 35,000 passing yards in his first nine seasons. He has completed 287 passes of 25+ yards since he entered the league in 2014, the fifth-most in the NFL over that span. His 149 starts are the most by a quarterback since 2014.

• Carr enjoyed a successful Saints debut in the Sept. 10 win over Tennessee, when he completed 23-of-33 passes (69.7%) for 305 yards with one touchdown, one interception and a 96.1 passer rating.

• Carr helped lead New Orleans to a 20-17 victory at Carolina on Monday Night Football on Sept. 18, when in the second half, he completed a 42-yard pass to Chris Olave and a 45-yard pass to Rashid Shaheed to set up the Saints' two touchdowns.

• On Sept. 24 at Green Bay, Carr had completed 13-of-18 (72.2%) of his passes for 103 yards with an eight-yard scoring throw to TE Jimmy Graham and a 104.6 passer rating to help put New Orleans ahead 17-0 over the Packers before being forced to leave in the third quarter with a sprained AC joint injury.

• Carr was a model of efficiency in the Oct. 8 34-0 shutout of New England, completing 18-of-26 passes (69.2%) for 183 yards with two touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 114.7 passer rating, his highest as a Saint to date.

• On Oct. 15 at Houston, Carr finished 32-of-50 passing (64.0 pct.) for 353 yards, one touchdown and one interception, also carrying two yards for a first down. It was the tenth-highest passing yardage total of Carr's career and his highest total as a Saint to date.

• On Thursday vs. Jacksonville, Carr completed 33-of-55 passes for 301 yards with a 17-yard touchdown pass to WR Michael Thomas, as he became the first Saints passer to have back-to-back weeks of at least 300 yards passing since Drew Brees in Weeks 14 and 15 of the 2019 campaign.

JAMEIS WINSTON

- The 2013 Heisman Trophy winner at Florida State and the first pick in the 2015 NFL Draft, Winston has appeared in 88 games with 80 starts, completing 1,748-of-2,852 passes (61.3%) for 21,941 yards with 139 touchdowns, 97 interceptions and an 87.5 rating, adding 1,220 rushing yards and 11 touchdowns. In 2021, before suffering a season-ending knee injury in Week Eight, Winston completed 95-of-161 passes for 1,170 yards, 14 touchdowns, three interceptions and a 102.8 passer rating, ranked first in the NFL at the time of his injury in touchdown percentage (8.7).

- Serving as the backup to Carr with extensive starting experience, Winston has completed 10-of-17 passes for 101 yards.

TAYSOM HILL

- Hill's brought unheralded versatility to the Saints offense and special teams. A constant participant on special teams from midseason in 2017 to midseason in 2020, as well as the backup signal-caller and as a runner and receiver, in 2018, Hill averaged 24.9 yards per return on 14 kickoff returns, had six coverage stops, second on the team, completed a ten-yard pass on a fake punt and blocked a punt. Overall, Hill carried 37 times for 196 yards (5.3 avg.), third on the team, with two touchdowns and completed three of seven passes for 64 yards. The blocked punt that sparked a division-clinching win at Tampa Bay, earned him Week 14 NFC Special Teams Player of the Week honors. In the postseason, he caught a touchdown, made a special teams tackle and executed a successful fake punt, making significant contributions in all facets as the team advanced to the NFC Championship game for the third time in franchise history.

- In 2019, Hill carried 27 times for 156 yards (5.8 avg.) with a touchdown, catching 19 passes for 234 yards with six TDs, deflecting a punt and posting two coverage stops. He ranked third on the club in touchdowns and third in receiving TDs. After a multi-threat performance Thanksgiving night at Atlanta, when he deflected a punt and caught and rushed for a touchdown. Hill became the first quarterback to rush for and catch a touchdown in the same contest since Jim McMahon (1983). In a valiant postseason effort vs. Minnesota, Hill led the team in rushing with four carries for 50 yards, caught two passes for 25 yards with a TD and completed a 50-yard pass.

- In 2020, Hill contributed on multiple facets, completing 88-of-121 passes (72.7%) for 928 yards with a 98.8 rating, rushing 87 times for 457 (5.3 avg.) yards with eight touchdowns, catching eight passes for 98 yards with a TD and playing on special teams units until Brees' rib injury. Following Brees' injury, Nov. 15, Hill went 3-1 in four starts.

- In 12 games with nine starts in 2021, providing value at quarterback on offense and special teams, he completed 78-of-134 passes for 978 yards with four touchdowns, carried 70 times for 374 yards (5.3 avg.) with a club-best five touchdowns, caught four passes for 52 yards and added a special teams stop.

- In 2022, Hill assisted the Black and Gold offense in multiple facets. He contributed on both offense and special teams in the season opener at Atlanta, Hill carried four times for a club-best 81 yards (20.3 avg.), including a career-long 57-yard carry, as well as an 11-yard rushing touchdown on the same first quarter drive of his long run. Hill also caught a pass for a two-yard gain and contributed on multiple special teams units both on the coverage and return teams. Overall, he ranked second on the team in rushing with 96 carries for a career-high 575 yards (club-

best 6.0 avg.) with a club-best seven rushing touchdowns, nine catches for 75 yards with two scores, leading the team in total touchdowns, while completing 13-of-19 passes for 240 yards with two touchdown throws and a 146.3 passer rating.

- In 2023, Hill has carried 29 times for 140 yards (4.8 avg.), scoring his first touchdown of the season on a one-yard carry Thursday night at Jacksonville. He has also caught 15 passes for 115 yards and completed all three passing attempts for 25 yards, while adding one special teams tackle.

ALVIN KAMARA

- A talented runner and receiver with a 5-10, 215-pound frame who was selected by the Saints in the third round of the 2017 NFL Draft out of the University of Tennessee, Kamara enjoyed an outstanding rookie campaign. He ranked first on the club and sixth in the NFL in yards from scrimmage (1,554), second on the team in rushing and receiving, carrying 120 times for 728 yards (6.1 avg.) with eight TDs and a two-point conversion, catching 81 passes for 826 yards (10.2 avg.) with five TDs and a kickoff return for a TD for a club rookie record 14 total scores, tied for second in the NFL. Kamara finished first in the NFL in yards per carry.

- Kamara was the first Saints offensive rookie selected to the Pro Bowl since Rueben Mayes (1986), as an AP second team All-Pro (flex), the clubs' first rookie All-Pro since 1993. He was named *The Sporting News* NFL Rookie of the Year and AP NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year.

SCRIMMAGE LEADER

Since entering the National Football League in 2017, Kamara ranks second in the league in total yards from scrimmage (9,326). Kamara is the first NFL player since Julio Jones (2014-19) to have six consecutive seasons of at least 1,300 total yards from scrimmage. Kamara surpassed Christian McCaffrey for second in Week Seven with a 153-yard performance against Jacksonville on Thursday night.

JAMAAL WILLIAMS

- Signed by the Saints as an unrestricted free agent from Detroit in the offseason, Williams is a talented runner who had a breakout season in 2022, as he led the National Football League and set a Lions single-season franchise record for rushing touchdowns with 17. In 17 games with nine starts for Detroit, Williams added on 262 attempts for 1,066 rushing yards and 12 receptions for 73 yards, producing the first 1,000 yard rushing season of his career.

- The former BYU star's talent came consistently all over the field, as well as in short bursts, as ten of his rushing touchdowns in 2022 came from exactly one yard out, tied for third-most in NFL history. A sound ballcarrier, he went 752 career touches before fumbling the ball and became the league's first active running back to reach 600 carries before fumbling.

- Since being drafted by Green Bay in the fourth round (134th overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft, Williams has played in 93 games with 42 starts, totaling 947 attempts for 3,740 yards and 30 touchdowns, while adding 162 receptions for 1,198 yards and eight touchdowns against only five fumbles.

WIDE RECEIVERS

CHRIS OLAVE

• A talented wide receiver who became one of the most prolific receivers in Buckeyes history, Olave played in 47 games and caught 176 passes for 2,711 yards (15.4 avg.) with 35 touchdowns. Olave's 35 career touchdown receptions set an Ohio State program record and ranks fourth in Big Ten history. His 11 career 100-yard games also ranks second in school history. Olave entered the starting lineup in 2019 with immediate results. He helped lead the Buckeyes to three consecutive Big Ten championships (2018-2020) and back-to-back College Football Playoff appearances (2019, 2020). In the 2020 CFP Semifinal vs. Clemson, Olave had a career night, hauling in six passes for 132 yards and two touchdowns in a 49-28 win, securing a bid to play in the championship game. Olave seamlessly integrated into the Saints offense following a standout senior campaign, where he caught 65 passes for 936 yards (14.4 avg.) and 13 touchdowns, tied for sixth nationally, as he was selected as an AFCA first-team All-American and a consensus second-team All-American.

• Following a September, where he captured NFL Offensive Rookie of the Month honors with 17 grabs for a league rookie-best 268 yards, including scoring receiving touchdowns in back to back contests, Olave led the team in receiving, yards per catch and receiving yardage with 72 grabs for 1,042 yards (14.5 avg.) with four touchdowns along with a successful two-point conversion, ranking second among rookies in receiving yardage and tied for second in catches and third down grabs (26). Olave became the first Saints rookie since Danny Abramowicz (1967) to lead the team in receiving, receiving yardage and yards per catch in his first campaign. The receiving yardage total was

second all-time among Saints rookies, as he was only the third Black and Gold rookie to reach 1,000.

MICHAEL THOMAS

- A talented wideout with a 6-3, 212-pound frame who was selected by the Saints in the second round of the 2016 NFL Draft out of Ohio State, Thomas had an outstanding rookie campaign, leading the team with 92 receptions for 1,137 yards and a nine touchdowns. He became the first Saints rookie to break 1,000 yards since Marques Colston (1,038-2006). TIGHT ENDS

JUWAN JOHNSON

- The former Penn State and Oregon wideout joined the Saints in 2020 following the NFL Draft and transitioned to tight end his second season. In 2022, the New Jersey native had a breakout campaign as he appeared in 16 games with 12 starts and finished with 42 receptions for 508 yards and a team-best seven touchdown grabs. Johnson's touchdown grab total was tied for third among National Football League tight ends.

- In three games in 2023, Johnson has seven receptions for 61 yards. After missing the last four contests with a calf injury, Johnson's return to practice and eventual play is anticipated.

FOSTER MOREAU

- This veteran tight end and New Orleans native enters his fifth National Football League season and first with the Black and Gold after spending his first four seasons with the Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders. In his career, Moreau has appeared in 66 regular season games with 38 starts and has recorded 101 receptions for 1,199 yards (11.9 avg.) with 13 touchdowns and has posted at least 30 catches in each of his last two campaigns. In 2022, the former Jesuit High School and LSU standout set career-highs in receptions (33) and receiving yards (420), while adding two touchdowns.

- Moreau got on the scoreboard for the first time as a Saint on Oct. 8 at New England with a fourth quarter six-yard grab. He has ten grabs for 92 yards to lead the tight ends corps in receiving.

JIMMY GRAHAM

• New Orleans’ third round draft choice in 2010 after playing four years of basketball and just one year of football at the University of Miami (Fla.). Graham broke out in his second year with the Saints totaling 99 catches for 1,310 yards with 11 touchdowns and went on to lead the team in receiving for four consecutive seasons. Graham’s production has been among the top 10 in NFL history at the tight end position in all three major categories: receptions, yards, and receiving touchdowns. Graham posts career totals of 714 receptions, 8,514 yards, and 86 touchdowns. His 86 receiving touchdowns rank 4th all time among NFL tight ends, while his 52 touchdowns as a Saint rank 2nd in franchise history. He and Kansas City’s Travis Kelce are the only two tight ends in NFL history to have multiple seasons of 1,200-plus receiving yards and 10- plus receiving touchdowns. Graham returns to New Orleans, the location of his most personal and team success, after playing in seven campaigns with three other teams.

including a three-sack performance on Jan. 1, 2023 at Philadelphia that made him the franchise's all-time leader in sacks, the same opponent of his first three-sack performance in 2012. VERSATILE DEFENDER

Jordan's the only NFL defender to record at least 300 tackles, 60 sacks, 75 stops for loss and 90 quarterback hits since 2017. Since 2017, Jordan has posted 359 stops, 70 sacks, 87 tackles for loss and 128 QB hits.

FOUR IN A ROW

Jordan's had three consecutive contests of at least one sack in 2013, 2014, 2016, 2017-19 and 2021-22. With at least one sack in the final four contests of 2021, Jordan did so twice in a season for the first time. In the 2021 finale at Atlanta, when Jordan dropped Falcons signal-caller Matt Ryan for the 23rd time, he finished the campaign with least one takedown in four consecutive games for the second time in his career, which matched a stretch from October 6-October 27, 2019. In the Oct. 9 win vs. Seattle, with two sacks of Seahawks QB Geno Smith, Jordan recorded takedowns in three consecutive games for the ninth season with his three-game streak in the 2022 campaign.

LINEBACKERS

DEMARIO DAVIS

• This dependable and sure-tackling defender joined the New Orleans Saints in 2018 after spending his first six National Football League seasons with the New York Jets and Cleveland Browns. For his career, the Brandon, Miss. native has appeared in 184 career regular season games with 170 starts for the Jets (2012-15, 2017), Cleveland (2016) and the Saints (2018-), recording 1,256 stops (809 solo), 38 sacks, three interceptions, 53 passes defended, three forced fumbles, seven fumble recoveries and 24 special teams tackles. With a club-best seven stops on Jan. 1, 2023 at Philadelphia, Davis joined Bobby Wagner and Lavonte David as only the third active NFL player with 1,200 stops.

• In 2018, Davis opened all 16 contests and led the team with 110 stops (74 solo), five sacks to lead the linebackers, four passes defended, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. Davis' abilities to diagnose and tackle played a key role in New Orleans ranking *second in the NFL* in opponent rushing yards per game and opponent rushing yards per play. Participating in the postseason for the first time, Davis led the defense with 22 stops (15 solo), an interception in the NFC Championship and a pass defense.

• In 2019, he posted 111 stops, ranked first on the club, four sacks, one interception and 11 passes defended to help spur the league's fourth-ranked run defense.

IRON MAN

Davis who had never missed a game in his career until December 27, 2021 vs. Miami due to COVID-19 protocols, ranks as one of the league’s most durable defenders, while playing one of the game’s most physically demanding positions. His 158 consecutive games played streak was the longest in the NFL by a position player and his 79 straight games started were the most at his position. In 2022, Davis was one of three Black and Gold starting defenders to open every contest, joining safety Tyrann Mathieu and defensive tackle David Onyemata. More impressive, he was the only linebacker in the NFL to play in every defensive snap for his teams.

PETE WERNER

- New Orleans selected this three-year starter from Ohio State in the second round of the 2021 NFL Draft. The Indianapolis native finished his college career playing in 47 career games with 35 starts, recording 185 tackles (111 solo), 16 stops for loss, four sacks, 11 passes defended, four forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Werner helped power the Buckeyes to the College Football Playoff championship game as a senior in 2020, when he was voted by Big Ten coaches as a first-team All-Conference selection and a Butkus Award semifinalist, posting 54 tackles, 2.5 stops for loss, one sack and two forced fumbles. Werner made his second career start Oct. 3 vs. the Giants and recorded a ten tackles. With 13 stops in Week Five at Washington, he became the first Saints rookie defender to reach double-digit totals in back-to-back games. He ranked fifth on the team with 59 tackles.

- Werner enjoyed a standout 2022 season, appearing in 12 games with 11 starts at weakside linebacker and ranked third on the team and second at the linebacker position, despite missing five games, with 79 tackles (55 solo), three stop for loss, three passes defended, two forced fumbles and one special teams tackle.

- Werner got off to an impressive start for the 2023 season, finishing second on the team with eight stops in the Sept. 10 season-opening win over Tennessee, one stop for loss and a split sack, his first career takedown. He recorded his first career interception this on October 8 in a 34-0 shutout at New England. Leading or tying for the team lead in stops in the last three contests, Werner has a club-best 47 stops, a split sack, one interception, one pass defense and one quarterback hit for the season from the weakside position. He heads into a homecoming on Sunday, where the Indianapolis native prepped at Cathedral High School.

SECONDARY

S TYRANN MATHIEU

- This versatile, hard-hitting, playmaking safety and New Orleans native returned home, signing after the draft and brings extensive experience to the secondary. Mathieu was selected by the Arizona Cardinals in the third round (69th overall) in the 2013 NFL Draft out of LSU and has played for the Cardinals (2013-17), Houston Texans (2018), Kansas City Chiefs (2019-21) and now the Saints. In 11 NFL seasons, he has played in 153 regular season games with 144 starts and has posted career totals of 722 tackles (600 solo), 42 stops for loss, ten sacks for a loss of 78 yards, 30 interceptions for 406 returns yards, four brought back for touchdowns, 93 passes defended, four forced fumbles, seven fumble recoveries and five special teams stops. Mathieu has been selected to three Pro Bowls, three Associated Press All-Pro teams and the Pro Football Hall of Fame’s 2010’s All-Decade Team.

NOSE FOR THE BALL

Mathieu came to New Orleans after starting all 16 games he played in for Kansas City in 2021 and recording 76 tackles, one sack, a career-high three fumble recoveries, one sack and two interceptions to earn his second consecutive Pro Bowl selection. With a team-leading three picks and one fumble recovery, adding up to a team-best four takeaways to go with a career-high 91 tackles (club-best 64 solo) to rank third on the team and first in the secondary.

Mathieu’s 30 picks since coming into the league in 2013 are tied for fourth in the NFL.

CB MARSHON LATTIMORE

.• Selected by the Saints in the first round (11th overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft, Lattimore started all 13 games he appeared in. He totaled 53 tackles (44 solo), a forced fumble, one fumble recovery, five interceptions for 85 yards and 18 passes defended, as he became the youngest Saint (21 years old) ever selected to the Pro Bowl and was selected as the AP NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year.

• In 2018, Lattimore opened all 16 contests and posted a career-high 59 tackles (49 solo), two interceptions, 12 passes defended, a club-best four forced fumbles (tied for fourth in the NFL) and three fumble recoveries returned for 91 yards, leading the team in takeaways and tied for the NFL lead in defensive fumble recoveries, the highest total among defensive backs.

• A standout 2019 campaign by Lattimore resulted in him being voted to the Pro Bowl, the only Saints cornerback to ever be selected multiple times. Lattimore started all 14 games he played in and posted 57 stops, one interception and ranked first on the team with 14 passes defended.

.• In 2020, he posted a career-high 62 tackles (52 solo), two interceptions and 11 passes defended as he was voted to the Pro Bowl for the third time.

.• After signing a contract extension in 2021, Lattimore continued to fulfill high expectations as he posted 68 stops, three picks, a career-high 19 passes defended, ranked third in the NFL and one fumble recovery, being selected to his fourth Pro Bowl.

.• After missing ten games (abdomen) in 2022, Lattimore returned to action Jan. 1, 2023 at Philadelphia and made an instant impact, tying for the team lead with six solo tackles, a team-high two passes defended and returning an interception 12 yards for a touchdown for New Orleans' first defensive score of the season. He started all seven games he appeared in and posted 21 stops, the pick for a score and four passes defended.

.• To open 2023, Lattimore came up with a standout performance in the season-opening win over Tennessee. In addition to his 15th career pick, to move him into a tie for eighth place in club record books in interceptions, he also had four passes defended, the third time in his career, he has deflected at least four throws in a contest.

GET A HAND ON

Lattimore's 85 passes defended since entering the NFL in 2017 are the most by a Saint and ranked third in the league despite missing ten games in 2022. In 2023, Lattimore is tied for the team lead and fourth in the NFL with seven passes defended.

CB PAULSON ADEBO

• New Orleans' third round selection (76th overall) in the 2021 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Adebo overcame not playing college football in 2020 to make significant contributions to the Saints secondary in his first season with the club. The Texas native finished his college career playing in 22 games with 21 starts for Stanford and recording 97 tackles, 34 passes defended and eight interceptions, earning All-Pac 12 honors in both 2018 and 2019.

• Adebo showed his development by opening opposite Lattimore in the 2021 regular season opening win vs. Green Bay and returning a pick 33 yards in the third quarter to become the first Saints defender to have an interception in his NFL debut since LB James Allen vs. Tampa Bay on September 8, 2002. He then added a second pick in the Week Five win at Washington. With a pick in the regular season finale at Atlanta, Adebo finished his rookie campaign ranked fifth on the club with 63 tackles (54 solo), tied for first with three picks and added eight passes defended and two special teams stops.

• Adebo fought off injuries and played in 13 games with 12 starts to lead the team’s corners with 60 tackles (51 solo) and added seven passes defended for the NFL’s second-ranked club in opponent passing yards per game.

•Sharpened by an extensive training camp competition, Adebo recorded his first interception since his rookie year in the season-opening win over Tennessee and a fumble recovery in a Monday night win at Carolina. After missing two games (hamstring), Adebo came back to action in the Oct. 8 34-0 shutout of New England and had two passes defended. On Thursday night at Jacksonville, he posted a club-best seven tackles, a team-high two passes defended and one forced fumble.

.•Originally a second round draft pick of the New York Jets in 2017 out of the University of Florida, Maye is a seven-year NFL veteran who has recorded career totals of 388 tackles (270 solo), 4.5 sacks, seven interceptions, 27 passes defended, five forced fumbles and one fumble recovery in 74 career games, all starts. SAINTS POSTGAME NOTES

- The New Orleans Saints fell the Jacksonville Jaguars 31-24 Thursday.
- With the loss, the Saints fall to 3-4 on the year. New Orleans returns to action to face the Indianapolis Colts on Sunday, October 29 in Indianapolis. Kickoff from Lucas Oil Stadium is set for noon central with the game regionally televised on FOX (WVUE FOX 8 locally).
- The Saints finished with 407 yards total net yards while surrendering 330 yards to Jacksonville.
- New Orleans compiled a season-high 18 points and 268 yards in the second half.
- The Saints held Jacksonville to just two conversions on 11 attempts.
- The Saints converted four fourth downs on six attempts.
- QB **Derek Carr** finished with 301 yards, one touchdown and one interception on 33-of-55 (60.0 pct.) passing. It was Carr's 36th career game of at least 300-yards passing
- Carr tied Ryan Fitzpatrick for 36th all-time in touchdown passes, now at 223. He also surpassed Matt Hasselbeck to move into 29th in all-time career passing yards (36,822).
- QB **Taysom Hill** scored a fourth quarter touchdown on fourth-and-one 0:39 into the fourth quarter, his first score of the season. Hill finished with four receptions for 50 yards and five carries for 18 yards and a touchdown.
- The touchdown was Hill's 24th career rushing score, and he is now in eighth place on the New Orleans all-time rushing touchdown list.
- The Saints held the ball for 12:50 in the third quarter. They had their longest touchdown drive of the season in the third/fourth quarter as well, going 75 yards in 16 plays and taking up 7:26 of the game clock.
- RB **Alvin Kamara** currently leads all National Football League running backs in receptions with 35, adding 12 catches Thursday for 91 yards. This is the second time this season Kamara has had 10+ catches, the first time in his career he's had multiple double-digit catch games in a single season.
- Kamara rushed for a game-high 62 yards on 17 carries.
- Thursday was Kamara's 45th game with at least 100 yards from scrimmage since 2017, the second most in the NFL over that period.
- Kamara also scored the game-tying two-point conversion, giving him five two-point conversions in his career and becoming the Saints all-time leader in that department.
- RB **Jamaal Williams** returned to the lineup tonight after being activated from Injured Reserve. Williams finished with five carries for 14 yards.
- WR **Chris Olave** led the team in receiving with seven catches for 57 yards.
- WR **Michael Thomas** scored a 17-yard touchdown (his first of the season) in the fourth quarter to tie the game. Thomas finished with three catches for 42 yards and the touchdown.
- CB **Paulson Adebo** forced a fumble by Jaguars WR Christian Kirk in the first quarter which was recovered by DE **Carl Granderson**. Adebo finished the game with a team-leading seven tackles, while Granderson added six total tackles.
- The Saints forced a second turnover on a special teams play, as CB **Lonnie Johnson** recovered a Jamal Agnew fumble.
- S **Tyrann Mathieu** had three total tackles, achieving 600 takedowns for his career.
- K **Blake Grupe** made three-of-four field goals, including a long of 42 yards.
- P **Lou Hedley** booted a career-long 63-yard punt in the fourth quarter.
- LS **Zach Wood** played in his 105th career game, moving him into a tie for 46th on the all-time Saints' games played list with RB Pierre Thomas and DL Willie Whitehead.

GAME RECAP

- The Jacksonville Jaguars defeated the New Orleans Saints, 31-24. Tonight's win marks the first road win against the Saints in franchise history. The Jaguars are 5-2 this season with a 3-0 road record and carry a four-game winning streak, marking the team's best start through Week 7 since 2007.
- In the first half, Jacksonville held New Orleans to six points. This is the sixth time this season the Jaguars defense has not allowed more than seven points in the first half.
- With tonight's victory, Head Coach Doug Pederson is now 8-0 in Thursday night games and 15-7 in prime time games.

PLAYER NOTES

- QB Trevor Lawrence completed 20 of 29 passes for 204 yards and a touchdown with a 100.4 rating. Lawrence's 20 completions puts him over 900 completions in his career.
- RB Travis Etienne Jr. recorded 14 rushing attempts for 53 yards and two touchdowns. His two touchdowns makes him the first player in team history to rush for multiple touchdowns in three consecutive games. Etienne also ties James Stewart (1999) for the most rushing touchdowns scored in a single game against the Saints in franchise history with two.
- LB Foyesade Oluokun posted his sixth interception of his career and his first-career pick-six. This is the first pick-six recorded on a Thursday in Jaguars history and the second pick-six on Thursday Night Football this season. Oluokun also posted 14 total tackles (nine solo), marking his fifth time recording double-digit tackles this season. His 14 total tackles are the most total tackles in a single game against the Saints in team history.
- With 1:33 left in the first half, P Logan Cooke successfully converted his sixth-career fake punt on a 13-yard pass to WR Tim Jones for a first down. This is the first time the Jaguars have attempted a fake punt since Week 16 of the 2021 season.
- WR Christian Kirk has recorded six receptions for 90 yards and a touchdown in tonight's matchup. His 39 receptions this season are the fifth-most among wide receivers through Week 7 in franchise history.
- K Brandon McManus' 43-yard field goal and four extra points in tonight's game puts him over 1,000 career-points across 151 games since 2014.
- CB Darius Williams posted five total tackles (four solo) and two passes defended. His 11 passes defended ranks first in the NFL.

(Opening Statement) “Obviously disappointed with the loss. I do think there were some things I saw in the game that were good to see. I thought our offense kind of responded there in the second half. I think right now, our team is too inconsistent right now and that's what's causing us problems so we'll have to work to get that corrected. We got 10 days to get it done.”

(On Jacksonville's last touchdown) “We ran a quarters coverage and the guy ran a good route on Tyrann (Mathieu) and sometimes that can happen in that coverage, you kind of get drained on the other side of the field. That's what I saw. I didn't see the finish and where everybody else was. I saw the route. I was watching that because I kind of thought that might be something that they would do and look, he (Christian Kirk) ran a great route and won.”

(On third downs) “I thought third down was a big down in the game. You're not going to win a lot of games if you're not able to convert on third down. We were able to convert with fourth downs. But that area has to be better. Obviously, we didn't finish in the red zone as well as we would have but if you're 50% of the red zone, in the National Football League, you're going to end up being one of the better red zone teams. There was some improvement there. I still think there's some things that we can be better at. I think there were some opportunities there that we just missed on. I think we're a lot closer, but we're still not there yet. And we're going to keep grinding until we get there.”

(On the extra days off) “There's a good little reset here. I told the team in there to get a little reset. So, we'll reset and evaluate a lot of different things over the next four or five days as we're starting to get into our next opponent. We'll figure out how we play a little better and be more consistent. I think that's if I had one word to say in terms of where we're at as a team is just, we're a little inconsistent. That's the challenge. We have to become a more consistent football team.”

(On the offensive line) “I thought the offensive line overall held up pretty good. I thought for Andrus Peat not to have played left tackle (in five years), I mean, I heard this morning it was 2018, so I thought he thought he did a good job. I thought Cam Erving stepped in and did a nice job at right tackle. Obviously Max Garcia playing left guard for us. I thought our offensive line, overall, I thought they did a pretty good job.”

(On the pass play in the red zone) “I think there's times where that can be a good play and we didn't execute it and certainly if we had we'd be feeling differently, but we didn't get it done.”

(On kickstarting the offense with uptempo) “No, that was kind of the one thing that we kind of talked about probably midway through the third quarter. We just said hey, look, let's get into some uptempo and see if we can kind of jumpstart this thing a little bit. We did and, and I thought our guys executed. If that was probably the most positive I could take out of what we did offensively it was sitting down a little something that. They can't live in that all game every game. You have to be able to do some other things, but it's nice to know that if you'd have to get to that you can get to it.”

(On Lou Hedley's lack of consistency) "I think he has to be more consistent. I can say that about a lot of our guys, that we have to be more consistent. I think there are a lot of guys that need to be (more) consistent."

(On Hedley's final punt of the game) "We need a better kick there."

(On Derek Carr and receivers not seeing eye to eye on some plays) "I think that's frustrating. That is probably one of the things that I'm most frustrated about is just that part of that inconsistency. We have got to...somehow, somehow, we have to get those guys on the same page. There's a lot that goes into that."

(On the offense's inconsistency) "Well, I certainly think that we need to be better. And again, (I) think the last couple of weeks, we've been able to do a lot of good things and yet there's going to be a handful of plays in the game that potentially could be the difference makers in the game. That's where we have to be better.

(On if they switched anything up on the defense) "Not a lot. There are a couple things we changed up. I thought they did a good job early on with gadget plays and things of that nature that ended up getting some yards. Overall, I thought we did a good job of stopping their run game. We have to do a better job of not letting the quarterback scramble. We have to do a better job of that. That was probably the thing defensively, that was the black eye on the whole thing. When you look at their rushing yards and what they were able to do rushing, a majority of that was the quarterback running the ball so that has to be better. I thought early on we didn't quite...I don't think we were as consistent defensively; I don't think we executed quite as good as we needed to. I think they beat us on a couple of plays that I would have liked to have seen us do better. We probably got to maybe a little bit more coverage as the game wore on. It kind of got into mode where they really trying to throw the ball it seemed like a little bit."

(On Carr's consistency) "I wouldn't say, much like I've said about a lot of our guys on our team, I think there's some things that he did really well. I think there's was a little bit of inconsistency. I think that overall is...that's part of the group. I think each and every one of us individually needs to be more consistent and I think if we're able to do that, then collectively as a group we'll be more consistent.

(On what Carr could do to improve consistency) "We're not going to try to point fingers at anybody. We all got to be better. I think that's something that we're going to continue to work on."

(On if there were sideline communication issues) "No."

(On the overall game): “No. 1 the biggest stat that matters to me is the scoreboard, right? The fact that we won the game. Now with that being said, I mentioned to the team that we had some guys who were banged up going into this game. Each man had to step in that gap. Everybody had to lift each other up. I credit our offensive line. Other than the scrambles where (Trevor Lawrence) got tackled, I think he stayed pretty clean in the pocket for the whole day. His performance, gutting it out like he did, Brandon Scherff gutting it out like he did, so many guys on a short week battling injury. To sacrifice that for the football team says a lot about the character of these guys. I am so proud of them for doing that. Trevor’s obviously one of those guys. Kind of everything else goes away – the fact that they gutted it out and made the plays down the stretch that we needed to, bust a route in the end zone on fourth down. Jamal (Agnew)’s punt return, did a great job of anticipating that. The fake punt. Christian (Kirk) and his touchdown in the end. There were a lot of individual efforts that were good to see. Just a lot of credit to those guys in the locker room.”

(On Montaric “Buster” Brown): “I thought he did some good things. He’s a young player, a second-year player for us. We were missing Tyson Campbell, so it’s next man up, and Buster’s the next man. He’s worked hard to put himself in this position. He works hard in practice. It’s not always going to be perfect or pretty or all of that, but you know what? He made plays when he needed to, and that’s the most important thing. Really proud of the way he played today.”

(On if he thought Trevor Lawrence would play today): “I wouldn’t say 100 percent. It’s not my decision to make. It’s Trevor’s, how he feels. He was feeling good last night, and he was feeling good today during his workout. I trust my players. I’m going to do what’s right, but at the same time, if a player, in this case Trevor, feels like he can go, I’m going to trust that.”

(On Trevor Lawrence setting career-highs in rushing yards with a sprained knee): “It just again shows the type of person he is and the unselfishness he has. I saw it last year when he got injured. He got injured in the Detroit game, and he battled injury throughout the rest of the year and gutted that out. This is different. This is a short week. On Monday, I would have told you he was not playing in this football game, but that’s not who Trevor is. Again, I’m proud of his effort – the ability to escape the pocket and run. Fortunately, they were straight-ahead runs. He didn’t have to cut too much. A lot of gutsy performances out there, and his is probably the No. 1.”

(On the team’s resiliency): “Listen, this is a good football team that we played tonight. They’re a well-coached, disciplined group. They’re aggressive on defense, and they’ve got every weapon on offense. We talked about it this week. It’s a 60-minute football game, and that’s what you’ve got to do. Guys own their jobs and do their role, and that’s all I ask them to do. They did that. Don’t do any more or any less. I challenged them to be great. They don’t have to be perfect. Just be great. Have great passion, have great energy. They did that tonight.”

(On having a long week to prepare for Pittsburgh): “We have to take advantage of the next three days. Players have got to get healthy and live in the training room and all of that, but at the same time, I want them to kind of take this mini-break, this mini-bye and coaches do the same thing, kind of get away, clear their heads. We have one more road game coming up, and then give them even more of a break. We just have to be smart with the next couple of days, anticipating getting some guys back next week that have been missing. We’ll do the right thing and look forward to that.”

(On the offensive lull at the end of the game): “Good defense. We didn’t execute very well, but they played better defense—stunting a little more up front, taking away some of the inside zones. They just did a nice job on defense. We got to look at this film and make those adjustments, make those corrections as we move forward.”

(On the offense opening the game and playing aggressively at the start): “I just think the guys are gelling together. They’re coming together as an offense. You know, we were able to run the ball successfully in a couple of those drives there. Trevor (Lawrence) was pretty accurate with his throws. Guys were making plays on some third downs. It just comes down to execution, you know? The last couple of weeks we were able to do that. Obviously, the end result was points.”

(On defensive play): “The defense has been playing outstanding all season long. They played great again tonight. It’s rare you’re on the negative side of the turnover margin and still win the football game. To hold them to field goals early, that was big. The guys came ready to play. Mike (Caldwell) had a great plan for them. They executed that plan pretty well. My hats off to the defense.”

(On the 4th-and-inches play): "We just got beat. We just got beat. Credit them."

(On if there was a thought to challenge): "It was confirmed. It was confirmed upstairs. There was no thought to challenge."

(On the frustrating slow start) “The slow start. I have been showing my emotions a little too much on my sleeve. I have got to kind of chill out and that’s me holding myself accountable because that’s not going to help anything. Just trying to be a calming influence in those moments especially during moments of heightened frustration- I can be that presence to calm everybody down.”

(On his exchange with Chris Olave) “I wasn’t talking to Chris, like the past two weeks I was just talking in general. There were some things that happened today that led to some pretty big negative plays that should never happened and I think that’s where my frustration came from”

(On how to correct the unacceptable plays) “I’m going to do everything in my power to fix it, and I know our guys will do everything in that power. It’s not malicious or coming from a bad place. It sucks right now. We are finding everything that sucks right now. We are going to point it out and call it out and work on that to get better as leaders-that’s our job whether it’s really good or really bad. I tell guys all the time we’re not playing the scoreboard we’re playing against our standard. We have to make sure not only throughout the week we have to meet that standard, but on gameday we have to meet that standard. I’m okay if a guy gets beat or if they make a play, they’re going to make plays, but there are some things in football that are completely controllable that I think we can do better”

(On if there were adjustments outside of just the hurry up that helped the offense get going that you can use moving forward) “I hope so, in that moment with the score what it was we had to play like that. I have always been most comfortable playing that way. When those situations happen, I felt fully confident in the plays that Pete (Carmichael), RC (Ronald Curry), Taysom (Hill), Jameis (Winston) and I talked about in the room. When we talk about this is what I’m going to, this is where we get to, this is our plan this week, it was good for us-especially the last quarter and a half, I thought we had life and we were putting pressure (on Jaguars defense). We were the aggressor in that moment.”

(On what concepts they can take going forward from the hurry up offense success) “That will be something the coaches look at for sure. There’s a lot of moving parts, what are we putting on everybody’s plate and what decisions to we make as a whole team not just for us (offense).”

(On teammates picking up Foster Moreau after the game) “It doesn’t come down to one play. And our job as brothers, family, teammates is to go rally around him. I’ve been in that moment where I miss a throw or throw a bad pick (interception), and you feel like everyone hates you. But our job as teammates no matter the situation-good or bad-put our arm around him and keep him pushing. Seeing our teammates react that way (picking him up) shows me that have a good group because I’ve seen moments like that where everybody just starts pointing fingers at that one play, or if a kicker misses one at the end everyone points at them. There’s 160 other plays that could’ve been changed throughout the game. I have never been a believer that you point a finger just because it happens in that moment. There’s so many things we could’ve done to not even be in that situation.

(On running fade routes in critical moments late in games) “They got us a good touchdown to Mike (Thomas) and then obviously they had a backup in against one of our best players. Looking at things, is there something else we can do there? Different position/route in that moment? We had hit one before so I felt confident in it again going back to it, but it didn’t work”

(On if his emotions affected his performance) “No. When I wear my emotions on my sleeve I snap the ball and it’s clear. That part is just more as a leader and letting guys see my demeanor. Kind of “hey guys we’re good. We’ll be there at the end” kind of thing.

(On his performance tonight and so far this season) “We have got to be better. I have got to be better, coaches, everyone. I thought as a team we did a great job fighting back in the second half, but we will all look at the tape and say we can play better. Anyone can stop the tape on a bad performance or

good performance and say, "he should've done this or he should've done that". There has been games where I've thrown for 400 yards and really didn't play good and there's been times where I throw for 180 and thought I played really good. There's so many things that go into it besides showing up on a Monday, stopping the clicker and saying it was this guy or that guy"

(On the offensive line performance despite the shuffling) "Very proud of them. That's a really good front (Jaguars), a lot of moving parts with new guys playing new spots. With everything some guys are dealing with, it's a big ask to have new guys come in and handle those blitzes and that scheme. I'm sure there's a few plays they may want back, but really proud of them."

(On Khaleen Saunders at fullback) "If he ever stuck to that, he'd be a really good fullback. We've seen his high school highlights-he's pretty impressive"

We just have to find a way to close out the game. We have to finish stronger. There were a lot of opportunities that we left out there. Hats off to those guys for starting fast.”

(On settling down after the fast start by Jacksonville) “I think we were just playing our style of defense. We studied those guys as best as we could on the short week. They threw the house at us. They had a couple of screens and a couple of reverses early on. They got 17 points out of it. We felt like we weathered that storm. I think once we settled down we were able to play our style of defense.”

(On the Christian Kirk touchdown) “It was a really great play call by those guys. They drained our front side defenders and by the time he caught it, he was full speed ahead. We have got to try to find a way to make a tackle. We missed two or three tackles. If we get him on the ground and hold them to a field goal, then maybe our offense can go down there and punch it in.”

(On if he felt Trevor Lawrence would be this mobile with the injury) “Anytime a player has an injury and shows up to the game, then we assume that player’s 100 percent. He’s an athletic player. He can extend plays and move the pocket. That’s a big part of his game.”

(On the importance of the next ten days) “Hopefully, we can reset and refocus. We need to look in the mirror. Each one of us individually can be better. We’ll have the weekend off to spend time with the family. We need to come back to work with the intent to win. That’s really the only thing that matters in this league.”

RB ALVIN KAMARA

(On the offensive line) “The line was fine. I didn’t have a problem with the line. We get paid a lot of money to have the next man up mentality. It is what it is. You have to go.”

(On going uptempo) “Any week when you go up tempo it catches the defense off guard. They don’t have a second to breathe. They can’t really do too much defensively. You are moving fast. You just have to get lined up and play. I think that’s an advantage to the offense. We like getting into that two-minute or uptempo kind of offense. We have a lot of advantages. I think we left some opportunities out there though. I think there are some matchups that we still have to take advantage of. We have to play matchup ball. It is tough because sometimes I think we are not playing matchup ball. We are just playing.”

(On offering words of encouragement to Foster Moreau) “Foster is a pro. Obviously, I did. There are going to be more plays. There are going to be bigger plays out there. I told him that he is blessed for what he has been through. That is nothing. I’m not worried about Foster not making that play. I don’t think we should have been in that position right there saying man he should have caught it. Of course he should have caught it. He knows he should have caught it. Anybody in that position should have caught it. We are pros. If there is anyone out there who is uplifting their teammates and doing everything that they can to try to get a win, then it’s him. I’m not worried about that. It is what it is. We are on to the next. It’s a loss. It is what it is. We are on to the next.”

(On teammates taking accountability) “We’ve been playing this game for a long time. Me, I’m not a ra ra guy. I don’t do a lot of talking. If you don’t go, then there is nothing that I can say. I can’t transfer my energy to you. All I can do is to go out there and say what I need to say. I pick my spots wisely because when I say something I want it to mean something. I don’t want to be the guy saying let’s go, let’s go, let’s go. It falls on deaf ears sometimes. What do you do. You have to find a way every day. My message today is that I feel better than ever. We lost, but I’m blessed to be able to play this game. I’m blessed to be healthy. I have a family. I have a daughter. I’m blessed. Obviously, you want to win. I’m blessed that my teammates were protected today. Nobody got seriously hurt. We just have to find a way to win. There is so much more to this game.”

TE FOSTER MOREAU

(On your teammates having your back) "It's tough in front of every man, woman and child that I've ever known. It's a dark place to be. It's the National Football League. It doesn't come down to one play, but it comes down to one play. Our team fought hard. It's unacceptable."

(On the difficulty of the play at the end of the game): "They pay us to do a job. It's routine. It was the right throw. It was the right read. I ran a little short on the route. I thought something different. That's a lack of focus. That's a lack of concentration. It's unacceptable."

(On how close they are to breaking through): "I'll keep it short. I don't know if anyone within 200 miles of this place wants to hear my voice right now. These guys are fighters. They are resilient. This is the right team. We need to take on opportunities. That's what it is."

QB TREVOR LAWRENCE

(On what he saw on the game-winning touchdown play) “Yeah, I mean I'm sure you guys asked Christian [Kirk] he kind of did all the work there. It's a play that we run you know we like it out of (an) empty (set) and it's good matchup typically for us with Christian and just read it top down. I gave Evan (Engram) a look, it was split safety and the safety attached Evan and then just had our one on one and Christian ran a great route underneath and honestly just trying to at least get something going and get a get a completion kind of how we played the whole game especially with not wanting to hold the ball back there with my knee (injury) and not take any hits and all that stuff so just wanted to find a completion and get us going and worst case like let's get some points, let's get a field goal. The game was tight at that point. And then Christian ran through it. I thought it was going to be, maybe a ten-yard gain. I knew he had 20 on the angle, but then he took off and took it to the house. So that was a great play by him to finish it and see that opportunity and go get it.”

(On how his knee held up) “It's good. I mean, golly, it is crazy how you have you have something like that going on and you do not plan on moving a lot and you end up running the ball more than I usually do. So, it's just funny how that works. But, it felt pretty good. I was happy with it and (it) didn't bother me too much. Definitely did not set it back. So, I am really happy with that and that was the goal, to play, find a way to win the game and not set it back and we have ten days now to recover and get ready for Pittsburgh. So it went perfect, honestly.”

“There were some questions just because it was a short week. On a short week it's tough to decide on how much you test it and push it because you only have some so much time you want to make it sore for the game. So that was kind of what we were debating is you know, how hard do we push it? Tuesday Wednesday, Monday I wouldn't do anything. It did not feel good at all on Monday. So really our medical team did an amazing job of just kind of getting me to where I could play, and I felt much better than I thought I would on Monday especially, so credit goes to them but yeah. Getting in and moving out there today obviously had some discomfort. Of course, you're going to but felt confident enough to go out there and play and felt like I could, you know, somewhat be myself and go play and I was able to so I'm thankful for those guys for taking care of me.

(On when he found out he was named starter): “I don't know. Like I said, that wasn't the plan. It wasn't the plan, but you know, instincts kind of take over and I'm glad that it was able to hold up and I was able to feel good enough to make those plays. I think those were needed at times. You have to give credit to that Saints defense. They are a good defense. They gave us some tough looks. The guys up front did a heck of a job blocking and giving me opportunities down the field. Then when I needed to scramble, I had clean lanes. And you know, I don't know if that was part of the Saints plan to bring those pressures with me maybe not being able to be as mobile, but the lanes opened up and presented itself and I took advantage.”

WR CHRISTIAN KIRK

(On his recollection of the game-winning touchdown) “Yeah, it was actually a play that we had ran in London but didn't have the opportunity to hit. It's a play that we know well and in situations like that, it's kind of good for us all but when I motioned over, they had Tyrann Mathieu down low. I didn't think he was going to match me, but you know, after he popped out after the snap, I knew I was running my option route off of him so, it was just really beating him and then Trevor (Lawrence) did a great job stepping up in the pocket and give me an opportunity to catch a run.”

(On the offense second-half struggles) “Yeah, we got to be better in the second half, kind of coming out and not going three-and-out. We hit that lull that we have been seeing the past couple of weeks. So, I know this is going to be a point of emphasis for us to not find ourselves in these situations. Especially when you had a lead like we did. When you get into a lull like that you give good teams an opportunity to come back so, that stuff will get us beat ultimately. But I'm just glad we were able to make a play when it mattered. But we definitely have some room for improvement.”
