**THE MATCHUP**

The New Orleans Saints (3-3) will make their home Thursday Night Football debut on the NFL's Amazon Prime Video package when they host the Jacksonville Jaguars (4-2) on Oct. 19 at the Caesars Superdome.

The Saints are coming off a 20-13 loss to the Houston Texans at NRG Stadium. QB **Derek Carr** had his highest yardage total in his first six contests as New Orleans' signal-caller, as he finished the contest completing 32 of 50 passing attempts for 353 yards with one touchdown and one interception and added one carry of two yards for a first down. Carr's 353 yards passing marked his tenth-highest output as a pro and his 35th-career 300-plus yard passing game. Carr spread the ball to seven different receivers.

The second-year wideout duo of **Chris Olave** and **Rashid Shaheed** showed the ability to make explosive plays in the passing game. Olave caught seven passes for 96 yards, as he leads the team in receiving and receiving yardage through six games with 32 receptions for 414 yards. Shaheed exploded for with receptions for 85 yards, including a 51-yard grab and a first quarter 34-yard touch-

down, paired with two carries for 18 yards and a 19-yard kickoff return. Shaheed ranks second in the NFL with 757 all-purpose yards.

Defensively, LB **Demario Davis** led the Saints with seven tackles, one sack, two stops for loss, two quarterback hits and one pass defense. Up front, DE **Carl Granderson** finished with six tackles, one takedown, two stops for loss and one quarterback hit. Fourth-year LB **Zack Baun** recorded his first career interception. The Black and Gold tightened up in the second half, giving up just three points, allowing only 23 rushing yards on 11 attempts and 58 yards through the air.

The Jaguars are coming off a 37-20 win over the Indianapolis Colts at EverBank Stadium. Jacksonville had two touchdowns through the air and two on the ground, while they picked off Colts QB **Gardner Minshew** three times. The Saints and Jaguars are tied for second in the NFL with eight interceptions.

This Week In The NFC South: The Tampa Bay Buccaneers (3-2) will host the Atlanta Falcons (3-3) at Raymond James Stadium on Sunday at 12:00 p.m. CT, while the Carolina Panthers (0-6) will have a Week Seven bye.

THE COACHES

Dennis Allen was hired as the 17th head coach in New Orleans Saints history on February 8, 2022. Now in his 28th year coaching and 21st in the NFL, Allen has spent 13 seasons in New Orleans in two separate stints, including the six-and-a-half campaigns (2015-21) as the team's defensive coordinator prior to being promoted to head coach. He succeeded Sean Payton, who coached the team for 16 seasons, including the 2009 campaign, when Allen was secondary coach and ended with the Super Bowl XLIV championship. When Allen took control of a Black and Gold defense in Week 11 of the 2015 season that was ranked 32nd both in opponent net yards per game and opponent points per game, he methodically molded a unit that has finished in the top 10 in both categories each of the last three years. From 2017 to the present, New Orleans is the only defense in the NFL to rank in the top five in the National Football League in both opponent rushing yards per game and sacks.

In his first year as head coach of the Saints, Allen guided New Orleans through the challenge of significant injuries at several positions to win three of their last four games after a Week 14 bye and give up 20 or fewer points in the final eight contests of the season, ten points apiece in the final three.

Carrying over to the 2023 season, where New Orleans currently has a 3-3 record, a stingy Saints defense is ranked fifth in the NFL in opponent net yards per game and sixth in the league in opponent points per game.

Before rejoining the Saints coaching staff in 2015, Allen served as head coach of the Oakland Raiders from 2012-14 and as defensive coordinator of the Denver Broncos in 2011. Prior to his first stint in New Orleans from 2006-10, Allen was also an assistant with the Atlanta Falcons from 2002-05, where he received his NFL coaching start.

Over the course of his coaching career in New Orleans, Allen has coached linebacker Demario Davis and defensive end Cameron Jordan to career seasons. Davis has led the team in tackles in every campaign since signing with the club as an unrestricted free agent in 2018 and has garnered *AP* All-Pro honors four straight times. Since Allen returned to New Orleans in 2015, his 87.5 sacks rank third in the NFL.

Allen played safety at Texas A&M from 1992-95, where he started the final 21 games of his college career before being signed as an undrafted free agent by the Buffalo Bills in 1996. Prior to entering the National Football League coaching ranks in 2002, Allen served as a graduate assistant at his alma mater from 1996-99 and as secondary coach at the University of Tulsa from 2000-2001. He earned a bachelor of business administration degree and a master's in kinesiology from Texas A&M.

Raised in Hurst, Texas, Allen and his wife, Alisson, have a daughter, Layla and a son, Garrison.

Doug Pederson was hired as the eighth head coach in Jaguars history on February 3, 2022. Following a 3-14 season in 2021, Pederson took over the Jaguars and led Jacksonville to a 9-8 regular season record, an AFC South title, and a 27-0 comeback playoff victory against the Los Angeles Chargers in his first year. In 2023, the Jaguars have a 4-2 record, as they lead the AFC South.

Prior to coming to Jacksonville in 2022, Pederson served as the head coach of the Philadelphia Eagles from 2016-2020. Under his watch, the Eagles had a record of 46-39-1, including three straight playoff appearances (2017-19), two NFC East titles (2017 and 2019), and in 2017 led the franchise to its first ever Super Bowl Championship- a 41-33 victory over the New England Patriots.

Before getting his first head coaching opportunity with the Eagles, Pederson served as offensive coordinator of the Kansas City Chiefs where he was instrumental in the best years of quarterback Alex Smith's career and a 31-17 regular season record. From 2011-12, he served as quarterbacks coach for the Eagles and helped Michael Vick become the second signal-caller in franchise history to throw for 3,000 yards and rush for 500 yards in consecutive years in 2011.

Pederson enjoyed a 12-year National Football League career, playing quarterback for the Green Bay Packers, Miami Dolphins, Philadelphia Eagles and Cleveland Browns after originally being signed by the Dolphins as an undrafted free agent in 1991. He was a part of Packers teams that won Super Bowl XXXI, two NFC Championships (1996 and 1997) and six division titles. In addition, he was coached by three of the most successful coaches in NFL history- Don Shula, Mike Holmgren and Andy Reid.

He started three years at quarterback for Northeast Louisiana (UL Monroe) University, totaling 6,445 yards passing and 33 touchdown passes. He began his coaching career in Shreveport, LA at Calvary Baptist Academy from 2005-08.

A Native of Bellingham, Washington, Pederson was born on Jan. 31, 1968. He and his wife, Jeannie, have three sons, Drew, Josh and Joel.

SERIES HISTORY

The Saints have the upper hand in the regular season series against the Jaguars including winning the last four matchups and holding a 5-2 overall lead. New Orleans won the first ever meeting between the two clubs 17-13 in 1996 at the Superdome before dropping the next two contests 41-23 in 1999 and 20-19 in 2003, both at Jacksonville. New Orleans has hosted the Jaguars in 2015, 2007 and 1996 while Jacksonville has hosted the other four contests in 1999, 2003, 2011 and 2019. In an October 13, 2019 meeting at TIAA Bank Field, two sacks by DE Cameron Jordan and an interception by CB Marshon Lattimore led a suffocating New Orleans defensive effort that didn't surrender a touchdown for the first time since 2017 as the Saints won 13-6, driving for a fourth quarter touchdown behind QB Teddy Bridgewater.

SAINTS-JAGUARS CONNECTIONS

Saints Offensive Line Coach **Doug Marrone** served on Jacksonville's staff from 2015-20, coaching two games as interim head coach in 2016 before being promoted to head coach in 2017. He guided the Jags to the AFC Championship Game at the end of the 2017 season after finishing with a 10-6 record. His 2017 team was tied for the NFL's biggest win/loss improvement (plus-seven) among first-year head coaches and earned him AFC Coach of the Year recognition from the NFL 101

Awards. During Marrone's tenure in Jacksonville, the Jags were among the NFL leaders in rushing yards, ranking 10th in combined rushing yards with 7,212. In four seasons as the head coach of the Jaguars, Marrone coached six players to nine Pro Bowl selections and five players to six All-Pro selections. He coached the Jags offensive line for two years prior to becoming the head coach. Marrone and Jacksonville Senior Defensive Assistant **Bob Sutton** served on the same New York Jets coaching staff from 2002-05...Saints LB **Ty Summers** played for Jacksonville in 2022...New Orleans DT **Bryan Bresee** and Jacksonville QB **Trevor Lawrence** and RB **Travis Etienne** were teammates at Clemson in 2020. Etienne prepped at Jennings (La.) HS...New Orleans Head Coach **Dennis Allen** and Jaguars Quarterbacks Coach **Mike McCoy** served on the same Denver Broncos coaching staff in 2011...Saints Secondary Coach **Marcus Robertson** and Jaguars Running Backs Coach **Bernie Parmalee** served on the same Oakland staff from 2015-16. Robertson and Jaguars Defensive Line Coach **Brenston Buckner** served on the same Arizona Cardinals staff from 2020-21...Jaguars Assistant Running Backs Coach **Tyler Tettleton** served as an offensive analyst at LSU in 2020...New Orleans Defensive Coordinator **Joe Woods**, Robertson and Jaguars Offensive Line Coach **Phil Rauscher** served on the same Broncos Staff. LAST REGULAR SEASON MEETING

New Orleans Saints 13, Jacksonville Jaguars 6; October 13, 2019 @ TIAA Bank Field – The Saints won their fourth consecutive game and improved their record on the season to 5-1, despite missing quarterback **Drew Brees** throughout the winning streak defeating Jacksonville in a contest dominated by both defense and special teams, with timely offensive plays mixed in. It marked the first time New Orleans didn't surrender a touchdown in a contest since a 20-0 shutout of the Miami Dolphins in London on October 1, 2017.

The Jaguars won the toss and deferred to receive. The clubs traded punts for their first two possessions. New Orleans jumped out to a 3-0 lead compliments of a 47-yard field goal by kicker **Wil Lutz**. New Orleans took a bend but don't break approach on a Jacksonville drive midway through the second quarter as Jaguars quarterback **Gardner Minshew** completed 12- and 22-yard passes to wide receiver **D.J. Chark**, followed by some nifty runs by running back **Leonard Fournette**. But the Saints kept the Jaguars out of the end zone at their four-yard line and forced a 22-yard **Josh Lambo** field goal to close out the only first half scoring.

New Orleans recorded the game's only takeaway on the first drive of the second half when cornerback **Marshon Lattimore** picked off a pass intended for Chark. The Saints took the lead back on the next drive when Lutz drilled a 21-yard field goal. Midway through the third quarter, Minshew completed a pass for a 23-yard gain to wide

receiver **Dede Westbrook**, that set up a 32-yard Lambo field goal.

Between the third and fourth quarters, New Orleans quarterback **Teddy Bridgewater** drove the offense 75 yards in 11 plays on a drive that lasted 6:22 and he eventually connected with tight end **Jared Cook** on a four-yard touchdown pass to put the Saints ahead for good. New Orleans then defended a Jacksonville drive on downs at the Saints 40 and despite a quick three and out, then forced a Jaguars punt. The Saints then wouldn't give the ball back, holding it for the final 6:09 of the contest, converting three first downs.

Bridgewater threw for 240 yards and wide receiver **Michael Thomas** had eight receptions for 89 yards. Defensive end **Cameron Jordan** recorded two sacks to move into a tie with outside linebacker **Pat Swilling** for third place on the club's all-time list.

Offensive Assistant D.J. Williams - Father, Doug, is a veteran of Washington's front office, who won Super Bowl XXII as their starting quarterback, the pinnacle of a storied 12-year pro football career, which includes him being in the Buccaneers Ring of Honor, also working in the Tampa Bay front office.

Offensive Assistant **Jahri Evans** - Evans was selected by the Saints in the fourth round (108th overall) of the 2006 NFL Draft and spent the first 11 seasons of his 12-year playing career with the Saints. Overall, he started 183 career regular season games at right guard for the Saints (2006-16) and Green Bay Packers (2017), 169 for the Black and Gold. Evans was a six-time Pro Bowl selection, a five-time *Associated Press* All-Pro and was named to the Pro Football Hall of Fame's 2020's All-Decade Team, as New Orleans finished in the Top Ten in total offense each of the 11 seasons he lined up for the Saints, while the 196 sacks surrendered by the offensive line over the period were the lowest in the NFC and second-lowest in the NFL. After being selected as a consensus All-Rookie in 2006, Evans was a Pro Bowl starter and consensus first-team All-Pro each season from 2009-12. He was inducted into the Saints Hall of Fame in 2020, the Louisiana Sports Hall of Fame in 2022 and was a semifinalist for the Pro Football Hall of Fame's Class of 2023.

Defensive Assistant **Matt Giordano** - Giordano was a fourth round draft pick of the Indianapolis Colts in 2005 and enjoyed a nine-year NFL career with the Colts (2005-08), Green Bay Packers (2009), Saints (2010), Oakland Raiders (2011-12) and St. Louis Rams (2013), starting 30-of-116 career games, accumulating 202 tackles, one sack, 11 interceptions, including two returned for touchdowns, 16 passes defensed, two forced fumbles, 52 special teams stop and one coverage fumble recovery. He also appeared in seven postseason games for the Colts and Packers and was a member of Indianapolis' Super Bowl XLI championship team.

Secondary Coach **Marcus Robertson** - Robertson played in the NFL for 12 years with the Houston Oilers/Tennessee Titans (1991-00) and the Seattle Seahawks (2001-02) after entering the league with Houston as a fourth-round selection (102nd overall) in the 1991 NFL Draft out of Iowa State. Robertson was a first-team All-Pro at free safety in 1993 and 1997. The Pasadena, Calif. native finished his playing career with the Seattle Seahawks from 2001-02.

Pass Rush Specialist **Brian Young** - Played in the National Football League from 2000-08 with the St. Louis Rams his first four seasons, who originally selected him in the fifth round of the 2000 NFL Draft (139th overall) from Texas-El Paso and final five campaigns with the Saints, playing in 124 games, recording 22.5 career sacks and eight fumble recoveries. career by appearing in 162 games (144 starts), collecting 24 interceptions, 72 passes defensed, 11 fumble recoveries, nine forced fumbles and 795 tackles

New Orleans rebounded from a 26-9 loss to Tampa Bay on October 1 with a 34-0 shutout victory over New England on October 8 with significant contributions on defense that played turnover free football, defense that forced three turnovers and special teams that won the field position battle. The shutout victory was the largest margin of victory in a shutout at New England in their franchise's history. Including a 9-0 win at Tampa Bay on December 9, 2021 and a 24-0 win on October 30, 2022, the Saints are the only NFL team to have three shutouts in the past three seasons. Buffalo and New England (2) are the only other National Football League teams to have multiple shutouts in the past three seasons.

OPPONENT POINTS PER GAME

After ranking in the top 10 in opponent points per game in 2020 and 2021, New Orleans had slipped in 2022 to 31st (28.9 ppg.), going into the Week Eight contest vs. Las Vegas. BUCKING THE ODDS

The Saints have a long tradition of finding players as free agents signed after the draft that make an impact immediately or developing their careers initially on the team's practice squad. Several undrafted Saints on the roster play key roles on offense, defense and special teams that the club developed.

Wide Receiver/Return Specialist **Rashid Shaheed** came to New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Weber State in 2022 after being one of the all-time best Division FCS returners and after spending the first five weeks on the practice squad, made an immediate impact, becoming the only Saint to score a touchdown in each of his first two offensive touches. In the December 18 win over Atlanta, he finished with three receptions for 95 yards, with a 68-yard touchdown grab from Taysom Hill, the longest play from scrimmage of the season for New Orleans and the fifth-longest receiving TD by a Saints rookie all-time. On the Christmas Eve win at Cleveland in challenging conditions, Shaheed led the team in receiving with four grabs for 41 yards. In the January 1 victory at Philadelphia, he led the team in receiving for the third consecutive week, posting six receptions for 79 yards, including a 58-yard grab to set up a field goal. Overall, he carried four times for 57 yards with a 44-yard touchdown, caught 28 passes for 488 yards (17.4 avg.) with two TDs, returned 20 punts for 193 yards (9.7 avg.) and returned 14 kickoffs for 320 yards (22.9 avg.).

In 2023, Shaheed is no longer a secret, as he has caught 16 passes for 298 yards (club-best 18.6 avg., ranked third in the NFL) with a team-leading two touchdowns, including three grabs of 40-or-more yards, while also carrying five times for 28 yards and ranking second in the NFL in punt return average (18.3) and all purpose yards (757). On Sept. 24 in Green Bay, he had his first career punt return for a touchdown, the second-longest scoring return in franchise history (76 yards). This past Sunday vs. Tampa Bay, Shaheed had a 29-yard return, making him the first Saint to have a return of at least 25 yards in back to back con-

tests since Darren Sproles (9/25-10/2/11).

TE **Juwan Johnson** led his position group with four touchdown receptions in 2021, converting to the position after playing wide receiver in college and starting his Black and Gold career in 2020 as a wideout on the team's practice squad after signing as an undrafted free agent from Oregon. In 2022, he led his position group in receiving with 42 grabs for 508 yards with a club-best and career-high seven receiving touchdowns, tied for third at the position in the National Football League. Defensive end **Carl Granderson** played in 15 games in 2021 with three starts and posted 24 tackles and three sacks. In 2022, he posted 53 stops (30 solo) and a career-high 5.5 sacks, recovering the first fumble of his career, Dec. 5 at Tampa Bay. In the Christmas Eve win at Cleveland, Granderson, sacked Browns QB Deshaun Watson at the Saints 22-yard line on fourth down with 19 seconds left in the fourth quarter to secure the win. The following week on January 1, 2023 at Philadelphia, he posted two stops, 1.5 sacks, one stop for loss and two quarterback hits, as Granderson posted at least half a takedown in three consecutive weeks for the first time in his career.

Earning the starting right end position in 2023, Granderson has posted 23 tackles, leads the team with 4.5 sacks, tied for 12th in the NFL and has forced a fumble, signing a four-year contract extension on September 23. In Sunday's contest at Houston, Granderson had a standout performance with six tackles, including two stops for loss, one a sack of Texans QB C.J. Stroud in the fourth quarter.

P **Lou Hedley** was signed following the 2023 NFL Draft by the Saints out of the University of Miami, where he played from 2019-22 and punted 206 times for 9,315 yards with a 45.2 gross punting average and 77 inside-the-20. The Australia native, who won the punting job in a punting competition in training camp at 30 years old earned All-ACC second-team honors in 2021 and was selected as a semifinalist for the Ray Guy Award, honoring the nation's top punter. In 2020, Hedley was recognized with AP second-team All-American honors and a Ray Guy Award finalist, as the Hurricanes ranked second in the FBS in net punting average. In 2023, he has punted 31 times for 1,339 yards with a 43.2 gross punting average, a 39.8 net and 11 inside the 20-yard line.

Kicker **Blake Grupe** was signed by New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Notre Dame, where he played his graduate campaign in 2022, after handling kicking duties at Arkansas State from 2017-21. In 2022, he led the Fighting Irish with 91 points on 14-of-19 field goals and a perfect 49-for-49 in PATs. The Missouri native was Arkansas State's career record holder in scoring (354), field goals (64) and PATs (162). In the 2023 preseason, Grupe secured a roster spot, by making five-of-six field goal attempts.

In the team's first six games, Grupe has made 13 of 16 field goal attempts and all ten PAT attempts to lead the team with 49 points, with 25 touchbacks on kickoffs.

Grupe enjoyed a standout performance in the Oct. 8 34-0 shutout with a career-long 54-yard field goal and a 53-

yarder and hitting all four PATs to go with five of his seven kickoffs sailing into the end zone for touchbacks. Grupe became the first Saint to boot two field goals of at least 50 yards in a contest since John Carney (at StL, 9/26/04), only the fifth Saint to do so overall and only the sixth occurrence. He earned NFC Special Teams Player of the Week.

Wide Receiver **Keith Kirkwood** originally joined the Saints as an undrafted free agent out of Temple in 2018. The New Jersey native spent the first two months of his rookie season on the New Orleans practice squad, before being signed to the active roster at midseason and recording 13 receptions for 209 yards (16.1 avg.) with two touchdowns. He added one more scoring grab in the NFC Divisional playoff win over Philadelphia to help the Saints advance to the NFC Championship. After spending most of the 2019 campaign on Injured Reserve and playing for Carolina from 2020-21, Kirkwood returned to New Orleans in 2022, where he contributed on offense and special teams. In the 2023 preseason opening win over Kansas City, he caught a four-yard touchdown pass from QB Derek Carr.

PRACTICE MAKES PERFECT

A spot on the practice squad is another avenue to eventually get onto the active roster and have the opportunity to contribute. Below is an overview of nine key contributors players on the club's Week One 53-man roster with extensive practice squad experience.

TE **Juwan Johnson** was signed by New Orleans out of Oregon, where he spent his graduate transfer season, following the 2020 NFL Draft as a wideout. Recording four receptions for 39 yards in seven contests, Johnson spent the majority of his rookie season on the practice squad. Converted to tight end in 2021 and leading the position group with four touchdowns, Johnson took advantage of his first full offseason strength and conditioning program in 2022, led the tight ends group with 42 receptions for 508 yards with a club-best seven TD grabs, tied for third in the league at his position.

After spending his first three seasons with the Seattle Seahawks, contributing on both defense and special teams, DB **Ugo Amadi** split the 2022 campaign between the Titans active roster and the Kansas City Chiefs practice squad, also appearing in one contest for Kansas City. Possessing the versatility to play in multiple roles, Amadi secured a roster spot with the Saints in the preseason, recording eight tackles, one interception, two passes defended and one coverage stop. He has contributed on both defense and special teams in six games.

After splitting his rookie season in 2018 between the practice squad and active roster, DV **J.T. Gray** enjoyed a breakthrough campaign in 2019, when he was selected AP second-team All-Pro when he recorded 16 special teams tackles, one blocked punt and one coverage fumble recovery. In 2021, he was selected as a first-team All-Pro and to his first career Pro Bowl (starter), when he led the NFL with 19 special teams tackles (league-leading 16 solo). Gray led the team with 12 special teams stops in 2022, despite missing three games with a hamstring, the third time in four seasons, he has led New Orleans in coverage tackles. He has three stops in 2023.

Signed by Buffalo following the NFL Draft out of Fresno State, RB **Jordan Mims** rushed for 47 yards and one touchdown in the preseason and added 45 yards receiving. Signed to the New Orleans practice squad at the start of the regular season, Mims was signed to the active roster in Week Six and had an assisted special teams tackle in his NFL debut at Houston on Sunday.

With his 53-yard receiving touchdown on October 20 at Arizona, Shaheed became the only Saint to score touchdowns on each of his first two career offensive touches. In addition to finishing with 28 grabs for 488 yards (17.4 avg.) with two touchdowns, Shaheed also handled return duties for New Orleans since being activated, bringing back 20 punts for 193 yards (9.7 avg.). He made big contributions in the Sept. 10 season opening win over Tennessee with a career-high 216 all-purpose yards, including five receptions for 89 yards, including a 19-yard touchdown and a late fourth quarter 41-yard grab to help secure the victory. In the Sept. 18 win over Carolina, he posted four catches for 63 yards (15.8 avg.), including a fourth quarter 45-yard grab. On Sept. 24 at Green Bay, Shaheed had a 76-yard punt return for a touchdown.

In 2023, Shaheed has caught 16 passes for 298 yards (club-best 18.6 avg., ranked third in the NFL) with a team-leading two touchdowns, including three grabs of 40-or-more yards, while also carrying five times for 28 yards and ranking second in the NFL in punt return average (18.3) and all purpose yards (757).

Wide receiver **Keith Kirkwood** originally joined the Saints as an undrafted free agent out of Temple in 2018. The New Jersey native spent the first two months of his rookie season on the New Orleans practice squad, before being signed to the active roster at midseason and recording 13 receptions for 209 yards (16.1 avg.) with two touchdowns. He added one more scoring grab in the NFC Divisional Playoff win over Philadelphia to help the Saints advance to the NFC Championship. out of Boston College, cornerback **Isaac Yiadom** has played in 76 games with 21 starts for Denver, the Giants, Green Bay, Houston and New Orleans and has posted 119 tackles, a split sack, two interceptions, 19 passes defensed, one forced fumble and 24 special teams stops. After starting 2022 with the Texans, Yiadom joined the Saints practice squad midway through the season and upon being signed to the active roster, recorded two special teams stops in six appearances.

In 2023, Yiadom has contributed on both defense and special teams, playing in all six games with one start, recording 12 tackles, one interception, seven passes defensed to tie for second in the NFL and four coverage stops to rank second on the team, only two away from his career-high.

Ahead is a synopsis of several returning players and newcomers through the draft and free agency to the 2023 Saints offensive line:

Right Tackle Ryan Ramczyk - The Black and Gold used their second first round selection in the 2017 NFL Draft to snag Ramczyk out of the University of Wisconsin, one of the best offensive linemen in the entire draft. After opening all 16 games and both postseason contests in 2017 and being selected as a PFWA All-Rookie, he has been selected as an *Associated Press* All-Pro selection three times since. After missing seven contests in 2021, Ramczyk rebounded to open the first 16 games in 2022 and continues to anchor the right side of the line.

Tackle/Guard James Hurst - A nine-year NFL veteran who was signed as a free agent from Baltimore in 2020, Hurst has 140 career regular season appearances with 85 starts at four different positions on the inside and outside. His versatility came in handy in 2020, as he started two contests at left tackle and one at left guard, while the Saints gained over 200 yards rushing each time. In 2021, Hurst moved into the lineup for eight games at left tackle in place of an injured Armstead, two at left guard in place of an injured Andrus Peat and three at right tackle for an injured Ryan Ramczyk. Hurst started 15 games at left tackle and one at left guard in 2022. In 2023, Hurst has opened four games at left guard, one at left tackle and one at right guard.

Tackle/Guard Andrus Peat - A first round selection (13th overall) in the 2015 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Peat was considered one of the top college linemen in 2014. In nine seasons, he's played in 100 regular season games with 91 starts, opening a contest at every position except center. In 2020, he opened 13 contests at left guard as he was part of the NFC Pro squad for the third consecutive season. In 2021, he opened the first six contests, where New Orleans got off to a 4-2 start before suffering a season-ending pectoral injury. In his return to the starting lineup in the 2022 season opener in Atlanta, New Orleans rushed for 151 yards. In back-to-back weeks, Peat was a part of rushing efforts of 200-yards plus by the club for the first time since 2020. In 2023, Peat has started one contest at left guard.

Center/Guard Erik McCoy - New Orleans traded up in the second round of the 2019 NFL Draft to select this standout from Texas A&M, who was a three-year starter, anchoring the middle of the Aggies line. In 2018, he was a team captain who paved the way for the SEC's leading rusher and in 2019 was the first Saint in franchise history to start at center in Week One, opening all 16 contests. McCoy has opened all 63 contests he has appeared in at center and signed a five-year contract extension with the team in 2022.

Guard/Center Cesar Ruiz - The hard-working, talented and intelligent lineman is a perfect fit for New Orleans' culture. He was selected with the 24th pick in the 2020 NFL Draft out of the University of Michigan. The three-year letterman played in 36 games in college, starting his last 31 including the final 26 at center, earning All-Big Ten in 2019. Ruiz settled in at right guard in the last 15 games, with nine starts, as well as both postseason contests. When McCoy suffered a lower leg injury in the first quarter

of the 2021 opening win over Green Bay, Ruiz transitioned over to his natural position, where the Saints did not give up a sack in his four starts at center. He returned to right guard on Oct. 25 at Seattle and was the only lineman in 2021 to not miss a start. Ruiz opened 13 games at right guard and one at center in 2022 before suffering a season-ending foot injury Dec. 18, vs. Atlanta. The 46 consecutive starts for Ruiz at the time of his injury was the longest active streak for a Saint. Following an ardent rehab, Ruiz returned to the starting lineup for the season opener on September 10, the day after signing a four-year contract extension.

Tackle Landon Young - A mainstay at left tackle for his entire college career at Kentucky, Young played in 49 contests with 30 starts in his college career. The Lexington, Ky. native was selected by New Orleans in the sixth round of the 2021 NFL Draft and held up to the competition in training camp to snare a roster spot. Young opened one contest at right tackle in 2021 and serves as Ramczyk's backup on the right side, also playing jumbo tight end. In 2022, Young showed versatility. On October 13 at Pittsburgh, he slide over to left tackle for the second half to replace Hurst (concussion) and opened this the November 20 win over the Rams at one of the league's most challenging positions. In the January 1, 2023 win at Philadelphia, Young played the final three quarters in place of Ramczyk (hip) and then started the following week's season finale vs. Carolina.

Tackle Trevor Penning - The club's second first round draft choice (19th overall) in 2022 out of Northern Iowa, the 6-7, 322-pound Penning competed with Hurst for the starting left tackle slot in the preseason before suffering a toe injury. The Clear Lake, Iowa native brings athleticism and extensive college experience to the tackle position, where he played in 37 games with 33 starts. Activated for the second half of the season, Penning served as the club's sixth offensive lineman in jumbo packages and started the season finale at left tackle, carrying over in 2023 to see action at the position in all six contests.

Guard/Center Max Garcia - The nine-year NFL veteran was signed as a free agent at the start of training camp. This versatile lineman has played in 111 regular season games with 60 starts for New Orleans, Arizona and Denver, including opening his first contest of 2023 at left guard on Sunday at Houston. Originally a fourth round draft pick of Denver out of Florida in 2015, who started five contests as a rookie for the Super Bowl 50 champions, Garcia has opened 46 games at right guard, ten at left guard and four at center.

IN THE NFL

After finishing ranked seventh in 2021, surrendering 318.2 net yards per game, the New Orleans defense returned to the top five again in 2022, ranking fifth, while giving up 314.8 net yards per game. New Orleans and San Francisco are the only two teams to rank in the top ten each of the last three seasons and this marked the third time the Saints have ranked in the top ten in total defense for three straight seasons (1982-84 and 1991-93).

A third round draft pick of the Denver Broncos in 2018 out of Boston College, in addition to starting 21 of his 76 career contests on defense and posting 119 tackles, a split sack, two interceptions, 19 passes defended and a forced fumble, **Isaac Yiadom** has recorded 24 career coverage stops for five teams. Brought up to the active roster during Gray's injury, Yiadom brought a boost to the Saints coverage units with three stops, remaining an integral part of the group after Gray's return to the lineup and re-signing in the off-season. In 2023, Yiadom ranks second on the team with four special teams tackles, only two away from his career-high.

One of the club's two third round draft picks in 2020, **Zack Baun**, a former Wisconsin standout, has embraced work on the team's special teams units. He has recorded 20 tackles on coverage, one blocked field goal and 47 defensive stops, one interception and one pass defense. On Sept. 10 at Tennessee, Baun got his hands on a punt that went out of bounds one yard past the line of scrimmage, a game-changing play.

Selected in the fifth round of the 2022 NFL Draft by the Saints out of Appalachian State, LB **D'Marco Jackson** came to New Orleans as the only Football Bowl Subdivision player with more than 200 tackles and 25 stops for loss in the 2020 and 2021 seasons combined. After missing his entire rookie campaign with a hamstring injury, Jackson's hard-working and hard-hitting mentality has proven to be a good fit on the team's coverage units as he leads New Orleans with five stops, tying a career-high with two on October 8 at New England.

The success of the team's coverage units have allowed New Orleans to rank fourth in the NFL in opponent punt return average.

QUARTERBACKS

DEREK CARR

- On March 6, 2023 the New Orleans Saints agreed to terms with QB Derek Carr on a four-year contract to solidify the team's quarterback position. He spent the first nine seasons of his NFL career with the Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders. Originally selected in the second round (36th overall) of the 2014 NFL Draft by the Raiders out of Fresno State, the Bakersfield, Calif. native has started all 148 career regular season games he's played in, completing 3,331-of-5,158 passes (64.6 percent) for 36,521 yards with 222 touchdown passes, 102 interceptions and a 91.5 passer rating, while adding 852 rushing yards and six touchdowns. From 2014-22 as a member of the Raiders, Carr was selected to four Pro Bowl Games (2015-17, 2022) and set numerous team passing records including the franchise's career passing yardage and touchdown pass marks and single-season mark in passing yards (4,804 in 2021), as the only signal-caller in the team's history with multiple seasons reaching the 4,000 yard mark. He also holds franchise records from his Raiders tenure for multiple-touchdown pass games (69), contests with a passer rating of at least 100.0 (47) and 300-yard passing performances (33).

- Since entering the league in 2014, Carr ranks third in the NFL in completions, fourth in passing yardage and seventh in passing touchdowns. He became the third quarterback in history to pass for 3,000-plus yards in each of his first nine seasons, joining Pro Football Hall of Fame signal-caller Peyton Manning and Russell Wilson. He is just the fourth player in NFL history to reach 35,000 passing yards in his first nine seasons. He has completed 287 passes of 25+ yards since he entered the league in 2014, the fifth-most in the NFL over that span. His 148 starts are the most by a quarterback since 2014.

- Carr enjoyed a successful Saints debut in the Sept. 10 win over Tennessee, when he completed 23-of-33 passes (69.7%) for 305 yards with one touchdown, one interception and a 96.1 passer rating.

- Carr helped lead New Orleans to a 20-17 victory at Carolina on Monday Night Football on Sept. 18, when in the second half, he completed a 42-yard pass to Chris Olave and a 45-yard pass to Rashid Shaheed to set up the Saints' two touchdowns.

- On Sept. 24 at Green Bay, Carr had completed 13-of-18 (72.2%) of his passes for 103 yards with an eight-yard scoring throw to TE Jimmy Graham and a 104.6 passer rating to help put New Orleans ahead 17-0 over the Packers before being forced to leave in the third quarter with a sprained AC joint injury.

- Carr was a model of efficiency in the Oct. 8 34-0 shutout of New England, completing 18-of-26 passes (69.2%) for 183 yards with two touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 114.7 passer rating, his highest as a Saint to date.

.• On Sunday at Houston, Carr finished 32-of-50 passing (64.0 pct.) for 353 yards, one touchdown and one interception, also carrying two yards for a first down. It was the tenth-highest passing yardage total of Carr's career and his highest total as a Saint to date..

His 222 touchdown passes since 2014 are also the seventh most in the NFL over that span.

JAMEIS WINSTON

- The 2013 Heisman Trophy winner at Florida State and the first pick in the 2015 NFL Draft, Winston has appeared in 88 games with 80 starts, completing 1,748-of-2,852 passes (61.3%) for 21,941 yards with 139 touchdowns, 97 interceptions and an 87.5 rating, adding 1,220 rushing yards and 11 touchdowns. In 2021, before suffering a season-ending knee injury in Week Eight, Winston completed 95-of-161 passes for 1,170 yards, 14 touchdowns, three interceptions and a 102.8 passer rating, ranked first in the NFL at the time of his injury in touchdown percentage (8.7).

- Serving as the backup to Carr with extensive starting experience, Winston has completed 10-of-17 passes for 101 yards.

TAYSOM HILL

- Hill's brought unheralded versatility to the Saints offense and special teams. A constant participant on special teams from midseason in 2017 to midseason in 2020, as well as the backup signal-caller and as a runner and receiver, in 2018, Hill averaged 24.9 yards per return on 14 kickoff returns, had six coverage stops, second on the team, completed a ten-yard pass on a fake punt and blocked a punt. Overall, Hill carried 37 times for 196 yards (5.3 avg.), third on the team, with two touchdowns and completed three of seven passes for 64 yards. The blocked punt that sparked a division-clinching win at Tampa Bay, earned him Week 14 NFC Special Teams Player of the Week honors. In the postseason, he caught a touchdown, made a special teams tackle and executed a successful fake punt, making significant contributions in all facets as the team advanced to the NFC Championship game for the third time in franchise history.

- In 2019, Hill carried 27 times for 156 yards (5.8 avg.) with a touchdown, catching 19 passes for 234 yards with six TDs, deflecting a punt and posting two coverage stops. He ranked third on the club in touchdowns and third in receiving TDs. After a multi-threat performance Thanksgiving night at Atlanta, when he deflected a punt and caught and rushed for a touchdown. Hill became the first quarterback to rush for and catch a touchdown in the same contest since Jim McMahon (1983). In a valiant postseason effort vs. Minnesota, Hill led the team in rushing with four carries for 50 yards, caught two passes for 25 yards with a TD and completed a 50-yard pass.

RUNNING BACKS

JAMAAL WILLIAMS

- Signed by the Saints as an unrestricted free agent from Detroit in the offseason, Williams is a talented runner who had a breakout season in 2022, as he led the National Football League and set a Lions single-season franchise record for rushing touchdowns with 17. In 17 games with nine starts for Detroit, Williams added on 262 attempts for 1,066 rushing yards and 12 receptions for 73 yards, producing the first 1,000 yard rushing season of his career.
- The former BYU star's talent came consistently all over the field, as well as in short bursts, as ten of his rushing touchdowns in 2022 came from exactly one yard out, tied for third-most in NFL history. A sound ballcarrier, he went 752 career touches before fumbling the ball and became the league's first active running back to reach 600 carries before fumbling.
- Since being drafted by Green Bay in the fourth round (134th overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft, Williams has played in 92 games with 42 starts, totaling 942 attempts for 3,726 yards and 30 touchdowns, while adding 162 receptions for 1,198 yards and eight touchdowns against only five fumbles.

- In 2023, Hill has carried 24 times for 122 yards (5.1 avg.), caught 11 passes for 65 yards and completed all three passing attempts for 25 yards.

HILL MOVES THE CHAINS

ALVIN KAMARA

• A talented runner and receiver with a 5-10, 215-pound frame who was selected by the Saints in the third round of the 2017 NFL Draft out of the University of Tennessee, Kamara enjoyed an outstanding rookie campaign. He ranked first on the club and sixth in the NFL in yards from scrimmage (1,554), second on the team in rushing and receiving, carrying 120 times for 728 yards (6.1 avg.) with eight TDs and a two-point conversion, catching 81 passes for 826 yards (10.2 avg.) with five TDs and a kickoff return for a TD for a club rookie record 14 total scores, tied for second in the NFL. Kamara finished first in the NFL in yards per carry.

•Kamara was the first Saints offensive rookie selected to the Pro Bowl since Rueben Mayes (1986), as an AP second team All-Pro (flex), the clubs' first rookie All-Pro since 1993. He was named *The Sporting News* NFL Rookie of the Year and AP NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year.

TOUCHDOWN LEADER

In the Saints' 2020 Christmas Day 52-33 win over the Vikings, Kamara tied the NFL record for total touchdowns and rushing touchdowns (6), as he carried 22 times for a career-high 155 yards (7.0 avg.), adding three receptions for 17 yards for 172 yards from scrimmage. The rushing touchdowns record tied the record held by Ernie Nevers of the Chicago Cardinals since Nov. 28, 1929, while for total touchdowns, Kamara joins Nevers, Cleveland's Dub Jones (Nov. 25, 1951) and Chicago's Gayle Sayers (Dec. 12, 1965). WIDE RECEIVERS

CHRIS OLAVE

• A talented wide receiver who became one of the most prolific receivers in Buckeyes history, Olave played in 47 games and caught 176 passes for 2,711 yards (15.4 avg.) with 35 touchdowns. Olave's 35 career touchdown receptions set an Ohio State program record and ranks fourth in Big Ten history. His 11 career 100-yard games also ranks second in school history. Olave entered the starting lineup in 2019 with immediate results. He helped lead the Buckeyes to three consecutive Big Ten championships (2018-2020) and back-to-back College Football Playoff appearances (2019, 2020). In the 2020 CFP Semifinal vs. Clemson, Olave had a career night, hauling in six passes for 132 yards and two touchdowns in a 49-28 win, securing a bid to play in the championship game. Olave seamlessly integrated into the Saints offense following a standout senior campaign, where he caught 65 passes for 936 yards (14.4 avg.) and 13 touchdowns, tied for sixth nationally, as he was selected as an AFCA first-team All-American and a consensus second-team All-American.

•Following a September, where he captured NFL Offensive Rookie of the Month honors with 17 grabs for a league rookie-best 268 yards, including scoring receiving touchdowns in back to back contests, Olave led the team in receiving, yards per catch and receiving yardage with 72 grabs for 1,042 yards (14.5 avg.) with four touchdowns along with a successful two-point conversion, ranking second among rookies in receiving yardage and tied for second in catches and third down grabs (26). Olave became the first Saints rookie since Danny Abramowicz (1967) to lead the team in receiving, receiving yardage and yards per catch in his first campaign. The receiving yardage total was second all-time among Saints rookies, as he was only the third Black and Gold rookie to reach 1,000.

Olave has picked up right where he left off from his rookie campaign in 2023, as he leads the team in receiving yardage with 32 receptions for 414 yards (12.9 avg.) with one touchdown.

MICHAEL THOMAS

- A talented wideout with a 6-3, 212-pound frame who was selected by the Saints in the second round of the 2016 NFL Draft out of Ohio State, Thomas had an outstanding rookie campaign, leading the team with 92 receptions for 1,137 yards and a nine touchdowns. He became the first Saints rookie to break 1,000 yards since Marques Colston (1,038-2006). TIGHT ENDS

JUWAN JOHNSON

- The former Penn State and Oregon wideout joined the Saints in 2020 following the NFL Draft and transitioned to tight end his second season. In 2022, the New Jersey native had a breakout campaign as he appeared in 16 games with 12 starts and finished with 42 receptions for 508 yards and a team-best seven touchdown grabs. Johnson's touchdown grab total was tied for third among NFL tight ends.

- In three games in 2023, Johnson is tied for the lead among the Saints tight ends with seven receptions for 61 yards.

FOSTER MOREAU

- This veteran tight end and New Orleans native enters his fifth NFL season and first with the Black and Gold after spending his first four seasons with the Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders. In his career, Moreau has appeared in 64 regular season games with 37 starts and has recorded 94 receptions for 1,133 yards (12.1 avg.) with 13 touchdowns and has posted at least 30 catches in each of his last two campaigns. In 2022, the former Jesuit High School and LSU standout set career-highs in receptions (33) and receiving yards (420), while adding two touchdowns.

- Moreau got on the scoreboard for the first time as a Saint on Oct. 8 at New England with a fourth quarter six-yard grab. He has seven grabs for 59 yards.

JIMMY GRAHAM

- New Orleans' third round draft choice in 2010 after playing four years of basketball and just one year of football at the University of Miami (Fla.). Graham broke out in his second year with the Saints totaling 99 catches for 1,310 yards with 11 touchdowns and went on to lead the team in receiving for four consecutive seasons. Graham's production has been among the top 10 in NFL history at the tight end position in all three major categories: receptions, yards, and receiving touchdowns. Graham posts career totals of 714 receptions, 8,514 yards, and 86 touchdowns. His 86 receive-

ing touchdowns rank 4th all time among NFL tight ends, while his 52 touchdowns as a Saint rank 2nd in franchise history. He and Kansas City's Travis Kelce are the only two tight ends in NFL history to have multiple seasons of 1,200-plus receiving yards and 10- plus receiving touchdowns. Graham returns to New Orleans, the location of his most personal and team success, after playing in seven cam-

Jordan has posted 116 career sacks and is the only player to have 90 takedowns and 50 passes defensed. During this time, the Saints own a 57-23 regular season record when he corrals a signal-caller, and they boast a 24-3 mark in a multi-sack performance in the regular season, including a three-sack performance on Jan. 1, 2023 at Philadelphia that made him the franchise's all-time leader in sacks, the same opponent of his first three-sack performance in 2012. VERSATILE DEFENDER

Jordan's the only NFL defender to record at least 300 tackles, 60 sacks, 75 stops for loss and 90 quarterback hits since 2017. Since 2017, Jordan has posted 357 stops, 70 sacks, 87 tackles for loss and 128 QB hits.

FOUR IN A ROW

Jordan's had three consecutive contests of at least one sack in 2013, 2014, 2016, 2017-19 and 2021-22. With at least one sack in the final four contests of 2021, Jordan did so twice in a season for the first time. In the 2021 finale at Atlanta, when Jordan dropped Falcons signal-caller Matt Ryan for the 23rd time, he finished the campaign with least one takedown in four consecutive games for the second time in his career, which matched a stretch from October 6-October 27, 2019. LINEBACKERS

DEMARIO DAVIS

- This dependable and sure-tackling defender joined the New Orleans Saints in 2018 after spending his first six National Football League seasons with the New York Jets and Cleveland Browns. For his career, the Brandon, Miss. native has appeared in 183 career regular season games with 169 starts for the Jets (2012-15, 2017), Cleveland (2016) and the Saints (2018-), recording 1,252 stops (809 solo), 38 sacks, three interceptions, 53 passes defended, three forced fumbles, seven fumble recoveries and 24 special teams tackles. With a club-best seven stops on Jan. 1, 2023 at Philadelphia, Davis joined Bobby Wagner and Lavonte David as only the third active NFL player with 1,200 stops.

- In 2018, Davis opened all 16 contests and led the team with 110 stops (74 solo), five sacks to lead the linebackers, four passes defended, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. Davis' abilities to diagnose and tackle played a key role in New Orleans ranking *second in the* NFL in opponent rushing yards per game and opponent rushing yards per play. Participating in the postseason for the first time, Davis led the defense with 22 stops (15 solo), an interception in the NFC Championship and a pass defense. In 2019, he posted 111 stops, ranked first on the club, four sacks, one interception and 11 passes defended to help spur the league's fourth-ranked run defense.

IRON MAN

Davis who had never missed a game in his career until December 27, 2021 vs. Miami due to COVID-19 protocols, ranks as one of the league’s most durable defenders, while playing one of the game’s most physically demanding positions. His 158 consecutive games played streak was the longest in the NFL by a position player and his 79 straight games started were the most at his position. In 2022, Davis was one of three Black and Gold starting defenders to open every contest, joining safety Tyrann Mathieu and defensive tackle David Onyemata. More impressive, he was the only linebacker in the NFL to play in every defensive snap for his teams.

PETE WERNER

• New Orleans selected this three-year starter from Ohio State in the second round of the 2021 NFL Draft. The Indianapolis native finished his college career playing in 47 career games with 35 starts, recording 185 tackles (111 solo), 16 stops for loss, four sacks, 11 passes defended, four forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Werner helped power the Buckeyes to the College Football Playoff championship game as a senior in 2020, when he was voted by Big Ten coaches as a first-team All-Conference selection and a Butkus Award semifinalist, posting 54 tackles, 2.5 stops for loss, one sack and two forced fumbles. Werner made his second career start Oct. 3 vs. the Giants and recorded a ten tackles. With 13 stops in Week Five at Washington, he became the first Saints rookie defender to reach double-digit totals in back-to-back games. He ranked fifth on the team with 59 tackles.

• Werner enjoyed a standout 2022 season, appearing in 12 games with 11 starts at weakside linebacker and ranked third on the team and second at the linebacker position, despite missing five games, with 79 tackles (55 solo), three stop for loss, three passes defended, two forced fumbles and one special teams tackle.

• Werner got off to an impressive start for the 2023 season, finishing second on the team with eight stops in the Sept. 10 season-opening win over Tennessee, one stop for loss and a split sack, his first career takedown. He recorded his first career interception this past Sunday in a 34-0 shutout at New England. Leading or tying for the team lead in stops in the last three contests, Werner has a club-best 43 stops, a split sack, one interception, one pass defense and one quarterback hit for the season from the weakside position.

SECONDARY

S TYRANN MATHIEU

• This versatile, hard-hitting, playmaking safety and New Orleans native returned home, signing after the draft and brings extensive experience to the secondary. Mathieu was selected by the Arizona Cardinals in the third round (69th overall) in the 2013 NFL Draft out of LSU and has played for the Cardinals (2013-17), Houston Texans (2018), Kansas City Chiefs (2019-21) and now the Saints. In 11 NFL seasons, he has played in 152 regular season games with 143 starts and has posted career totals of 719 tackles (597 solo), 42 stops for loss, ten sacks for a loss of 78 yards, 30 interceptions for 406 returns yards, four brought back for touchdowns, 93 passes defensed, four forced fumbles, seven fumble recoveries and five special teams stops. Mathieu has been selected to three Pro Bowls, three *Associated Press* All-Pro teams and the Pro Football Hall of Fame's 2010's All-Decade Team.

NOSE FOR THE BALL

Mathieu came to New Orleans after starting all 16 games he played in for Kansas City in 2021 and recording 76 tackles, one sack, a career-high three fumble recoveries, one sack and two interceptions to earn his second consecutive Pro Bowl selection. With a team-leading three picks and one fumble recovery, adding up to a team-best four takeaways to go with a career-high 91 tackles (club-best 64 solo) to rank third on the team and first in the secondary.

Mathieu's 30 picks since coming into the league in 2013 are ranked fourth in the NFL after Sunday's 27-yard return for a touchdown, his first as a Saint. 2022 marked the fourth consecutive season that he led the team he played for in picks.

CB MARSHON LATTIMORE

• Selected by the Saints in the first round (11th overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft, Lattimore started all 13 games he appeared in. He totaled 53 tackles (44 solo), a forced fumble, one fumble recovery, five interceptions for 85 yards and 18 passes defensed, as he became the youngest Saint (21 years old) ever selected to the Pro Bowl and was selected as the *AP* NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year.

• In 2018, Lattimore opened all 16 contests and posted a career-high 59 tackles (49 solo), two interceptions, 12 passes defensed, a club-best four forced fumbles (tied for fourth in the NFL) and three fumble recoveries returned for 91 yards, leading the team in takeaways and tied for the NFL lead in defensive fumble recoveries, the highest total among defensive backs.

• A standout 2019 campaign by Lattimore resulted in him being voted to the Pro Bowl, the only Saints cornerback to ever be selected multiple times. Lattimore started all 14 games he played in and posted 57 stops, one interception and ranked first on the team with 14 passes defensed.

• In 2020, he posted a career-high 62 tackles (52 solo), two interceptions and 11 passes defensed as he was voted to the Pro Bowl for the third time.

• After signing a contract extension in 2021, Lattimore continued to fulfill high expectations as he posted 68 stops, three picks, a career-high 19 passes defensed, ranked third in the NFL and one fumble recovery, being selected to his fourth Pro Bowl.

• After missing ten games (abdomen) in 2022, Lattimore returned to action Jan. 1, 2023 at Philadelphia and made an instant impact, tying for the team lead with six solo tackles, a team-high two passes defensed and returning an interception 12 yards for a touchdown for New Orleans' first defensive score of the season. He started all seven games he appeared in and posted 21 stops, the pick for a score and four passes defensed.

• To open 2023, Lattimore came up with a standout performance in the season-opening win over Tennessee. In addition to his 15th career pick, to move him into a tie for eighth place in club record books in interceptions, he also had four passes defensed, the third time in his career, he has deflected at least four throws in a contest.

CB PAULSON ADEBO

- New Orleans' third round selection (76th overall) in the 2021 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Adebo overcame not playing college football in 2020 to make significant contributions to the Saints secondary in his first season with the club. The Texas native finished his college career playing in 22 games with 21 starts for Stanford and recording 97 tackles, 34 passes defended and eight interceptions, earning All-Pac 12 honors in both 2018 and 2019.

- Adebo showed his development by opening opposite Lattimore in the 2021 regular season opening win vs. Green Bay and returning a pick 33 yards in the third quarter to become the first Saints defender to have an interception in his NFL debut since LB James Allen vs. Tampa Bay on September 8, 2002. He then added a second pick in the Week Five win at Washington. With a pick in the regular season finale at Atlanta, Adebo finished his rookie campaign ranked fifth on the club with 63 tackles (54 solo), tied for first with three picks and added eight passes defended and two special teams stops.

- Adebo fought off injuries and played in 13 games with 12 starts to lead the team's corners with 60 tackles (51 solo) and added seven passes defended for the NFL's second-ranked club in opponent passing yards per game.

- Sharpened by an extensive training camp competition, Adebo recorded his first interception since his rookie year in the season-opening win over Tennessee and a fumble recovery in a Monday night win at Carolina. After missing two games (hamstring), Adebo came back to action in the Oct. 8 34-0 shutout of New England and had two passes defended

- Selected by the Saints in the second round (49th overall) of the 2022 NFL Draft out of Tennessee, Taylor shook off early injuries to play in 13 games with nine starts and posted 45 tackles (38 solo) and a club-best 11 passes defended.
