THE MATCHUP

The Saints [1-7] hit the road for the next two weeks prior to their Week 11 bye, starting when they travel to face the Rams [5-2] on Sunday, November 2, at 3:05 p.m. CT at SoFi Stadium in Inglewood, Calif., looking to snap a three-game losing streak. The game will be televised by FOX [WVUE FOX 8] and will air on the Saints' flagship station, WWL Radio [870 AM/105.3 FM], as well as the network of affiliates throughout the Gulf South. The contest will also air nationally on Compass Media Networks.

This will mark the Saints' second trip to SoFi Stadium to play the Rams in the last three seasons and the fourth consecutive campaign they play their former NFC West rivals. The Rams lead the regular season series 44-34, with the clubs splitting two postseason meetings. The Saints have lost the last two matchups against the Rams. Overall, the Saints have a 16-24 record in road contests against the Rams, 0-3 since the team returned to Los Angeles in 2016.

The Saints were defeated by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, 23-3, last Sunday. The Rams are coming off a Week Eight bye, winners of their last two, including a 35-7 blowout of the Jacksonville Jaguars in London on October 19.

The Saints defense is coming off of one of their most impressive performances on Sunday, when they held Tampa Bay to season lows for an opponent in first downs [14], third down conversion rate [3-of-13-23.1 pct.], total net yards [212], net yards per play [3.8] and net yards passing 124, while also holding the Buccaneers to only 88 yards rushing on 29 carries [3.0 avg.].

Returning from a calf injury that sidelined him for the season's first five games, defensive end **Chase Young** has been dominant the last two weeks. In contests against Chicago and Tampa Bay, he has recorded seven tackles [three solo], two sacks, three pass breakups, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery. On Sunday, he posted 1.5 sacks, a forced fumble/recovery and one pass breakup.

On offense, wide receiver **Chris Olave** has heated up, after missing ten games in 2024. Olave has opened all eight contests and ranks fourth in the NFL in receiving with 52 receptions, ranks 13th in receiving yardage [503] and is tied for seventh in third down receptions [13].

Around the NFC South: The Atlanta Falcons [3-4] play at the New England Patriots [6-2] and the Carolina Panthers [4-4] are at Green Bay [5-1-1].

THE HEAD COACHES



Named the 19th head coach in New Orleans Saints history on February 11, 2025 Kellen Moore joined the Black and Gold after serving as the offensive coordinator for the

Philadelphia Eagles in 2024. Under the guidance of Moore, quarterback Jalen Hurts and running back Saquon Barkley both had career years. Hurts finished with a career-high 103.7 passer rating, en route to Super Bowl LIX MVP honors. Barkley, who was named the 2024 National Football League Offensive Player of the Year by the *Associated Press*, had one of the best seasons on the ground in NFL history, leading the league with a franchise-record 2,005 rushing yards in the regular season. His 2,504 rushing yards including the postseason were a league record, earning Pro Bowl and All-Pro honors. The 2024 Eagles offense ranked eighth overall in net yards per game [367.2] and seventh in points per game [27.2]. Philadelphia rushed for a single-season club record 3,048 yards [sixth-best in NFL history] and finished second in the league in rushing yards per game [179.3]. Before joining the Eagles in 2024, Moore served as offensive coordinator of the Los Angeles Chargers in 2023 and the Dallas Cowboys from 2019-22 after starting his coaching career as quarterbacks coach in Dallas in 2018. In four seasons as offensive coordinator of the Cowboys, Moore's unit ranked second in the NFL in total offense [391.0 net yards per game] and scoring [27.7 points per game]. The Dallas offense was also the league's fourth-best passing offense [264.4 net yards per game] and ranked seventh in rushing offense [126.6 yards per game] over that span.

Moore played quarterback at Boise State [2007-11] before playing six seasons in the National Football League with the Detroit Lions [2012-14], Dallas Cowboys [2015-17].

Personal: Born July 5, 1988, in Prosser, Washington. He and his wife, Julie, have two daughters, Halle and Madelyn, and two sons, Kyler and Beckham. His younger brother, Kirby, is the offensive coordinator at the University of Missouri.



Sean McVay was named the 23rd full-time head coach in franchise history on Jan. 12, 2017. During the 2024 season, McVay passed John Robinson for most wins in franchise history. He also tied Robinson for the most playoff berths by a head coach in franchise history with six.

In 2023, the Rams finished 10-7 and clinched a Wild Card berth after going 7-1 in their final eight games. The Rams finished 5-12 in 2022 after an injury-riddled team forced young players to step up. The stars aligned in 2021 as McVay and the Rams went "all in" to win Super Bowl LVI. He finished the regular season 12-5 and became the youngest head coach in NFL history to win a Super Bowl.

In 2020, McVay and the Rams posted a 10-6 record, McVay's fourth-consecutive winning season, and earned his third playoff berth in his first four seasons. In 2019, the Rams posted a 9-7 record, the third straight winning season under McVay. In 2018, his second season as head coach, the Rams won 13 games, tied for the second-most single-season wins in franchise history, and competed in the organization's first Super Bowl. In his first season in 2017, the Rams won seven more games than the previous season, went from last in the league in scoring to first, and made their first postseason appearance in 13 years.

Prior to joining the Rams, McVay was the offensive coordinator [2014-16], tight ends coach [2011-13] and offensive assistant [2010] in Washington. McVay joined Washington prior to 2010 after an undefeated regular season with the Florida Tuskers of the UFL. The Tuskers finished a perfect 6-0 before losing in the UFL's inaugural championship game. McVay originally entered the NFL as an offensive assistant with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

The Atlanta, Ga. native played wide receiver at Miami [Ohio]. His grandfather, John McVay, served in various administrative roles, including director of research development for the New York Giants [1976] and vice president/director of football operations for the San Francisco 49ers [1983-94], as well as serving one year as general manager in San Francisco [1998-99]. John McVay oversaw five Super Bowl championship squads and earned induction into the 49ers Hall of Fame in 2013.

SERIES HISTORY

The Saints and Rams have played 78 times in the regular season with Los Angeles holding a 44-34 edge, while the clubs have split two playoff contests. Former longtime foes in the NFC West, the Saints have played only the Atlanta Falcons [113] more often [regular season/postseason combined.] In the 78 regular season meetings of the series between the Saints and Rams there has been:

- 1,624 points scored by New Orleans, 1,783 allowed to the Rams.
- A seven-game New Orleans winning streak from 1990-93.

- An eight-game New Orleans winning streak at Anaheim Stadium from November 8, 1987-December 4, 1994.
- 41 games decided by double-digits.
- Ten games decided by 21 or more points.
- 36 games decided by eight points or less.
- One 31-point win by New Orleans.
- A 31-point loss by New Orleans.

SEASON GAME SUMMARIES

WEEK 1: Arizona Cardinals 20, Saints 13; September 7 @ Caesars Superdome

- The New Orleans Saints fell to the Cardinals in the season opener, despite rebounding from a 20-10 third quarter deficit to come within an end zone throw of a game-tying touchdown.

Heroics on offense, defense and special teams aided the Black and Gold in a promising fourth quarter. With 4:40 left in the contest, Saints DT Bryan Bresee blocked a 46-yard field goal attempt. QB Spencer Rattler then converted a trio of first downs on throws to TE Juwan Johnson and WR Devaughn Vele and a 12-yard scramble by the signal-caller to set up a 28-yard field goal by K Blake Grupe with 2:44 left.

New Orleans then forced a three-and-out, punctuated by a third down sack of Cardinals QB Kyler Murray by CB Alontae Taylor for a 15-yard loss to get New Orleans the ball back with 1:49 left.

Rattler helped advance the Saints to the Cardinals 18-yard line to set up three tries at the end zone, the closest being a laser to Johnson that was broken up by Arizona defenders Jalen Thompson and Budda Baker.

Rattler completed 27-of-46 passes for 214 yards and carried four times for 29 yards. Johnson led the Saints in receiving with eight grabs for 76 yards. Murray completed 21-of-29 passes for 163 yards with two TDs and a 108.8 passer rating, carrying seven times for 38 yards. New Orleans RB Alvin Kamara's first half 18-yard rushing TD was the 1,000th touchdown scored at the Caesars Superdome.

New Orleans outgained Arizona through the air, 208-130, but the Cardinals held the ball for 33:46 of the contest to win the time of possession battle. The loss snapped a six-game winning streak for the Saints in season openers. The Saints fell to 15-17 against the Cardinals in the all-time regular season series.

Week 2: 49ers 26, Saints 21; Sept. 14, 2025 @ Caesars Superdome - The Saints dropped their second game of the season to the 49ers, despite bouncing back from a 26-14 early fourth quarter deficit to have a chance of winning the game in the final minutes.

An impressive drive and defensive stops paved the way for New Orleans to be back in it in the very end. After going down two scores with 12:18 left in the fourth, QB Spencer Rattler and company made some magic happen, converting three first downs to WR Chris Olave and RB Alvin Kamara to set up an eventual three-yard TD to WR Devaughn Vele. The score capped off a 13 play, 71-yard drive in just six minutes flat to bring the Saints back within five. After two three-and-out drives by both teams, Rattler led a charge that just fell short. Starting on the New Orleans' six yard-line with 2:40 left, the signal-caller picked up two first downs before the 49ers defense became too much to handle. Rattler completed 25-of-34 passes [73.5 pct.] for 207 yards with career-highs of three passing TDs and a rating of 118.1. He also carried four times for 14 yards.

Mac Jones went 26-of-39 for 279 yards and threw three TDs with a 113.1 passer rating. New Orleans outgained San Francisco on the ground, 121-77, but the 49ers beat the Saints in passing yardage, 344-307, and were 53% [8-for-15] on third down to New Orleans' 36% [four-for-11].

Week 3: Seahawks 44, Saints 13; Sept. 21, 2025 @ Lumen Field

- New Orleans' season continued to get off to a rocky start, as they fell to the Seahawks at Lumen Field.

The Saints had gotten off to a solid start, getting the ball first and QB Spencer Rattler completed a pass to WR Chris Olave and RB Alvin Kamara gained seven yards to put the team near midfield. However the drive stalled out and the Saints failed to convert on fourth down, giving the Seahawks the ball back. After a Seahawks first down, the Saints had stopped two run plays for one-yard gains, but on third down, DT Bryan Bresee was assessed a 12-yard unnecessary roughness penalty on a third down play that extended a drive and set up a touchdown. The Seahawks extended their lead to 21-0 by the end of the first quarter, where Seattle rookie WR Tory Horton returned a punt 95 yards for a touchdown and blocked punt set up a third score.

On a drive spanning the first and second quarter, the Saints got on the scoreboard with a field goal by K Blake Grupe, but the Seahawks took advantage of a long kickoff return to set up a scoring play of a 14-yard pass from QB Sam Darnold to Horton.

The Seahawks took a halftime 38-6 lead, while the Black and Gold kept up their intensity, holding Seattle to a pair of field goals and recording a turnover, while TE Jack Stoll scored his first touchdown.

"We didn't do enough to give ourselves a chance," said Saints Coach Kellen Moore. "We need to give ourselves an opportunity to compete in these games. Too many penalties, too many missed opportunities, big special teams plays early in this game that put us behind. I appreciate our guys' battle through the second half. They didn't quit and I do appreciate that. But this is going to be a very powerful lesson for our guys on adversity and how we respond, and simply, we can't start the football game like that with the sequence that we had and put ourselves in a really poor situation."

Rattler completed 28-of-39 passes for 218 yards with one touchdown. Olave had a career-high ten catches.

Week 4: Bills 30, Saints 19; Sept. 28, 2025 @ Highmark Stadium - New Orleans faced a 11-point deficit with 6:42 left in the third quarter and was able to cut it to two with 8:53 left in the game, but the Saints never took the lead. New Orleans rushed for a season-high 189 yards, scoring a touchdown on their first possession for the first time this season. But with Buffalo leading 14-7 in the second quarter, New Orleans was unable to capitalize or score points, when rookie S Jonas Sanker recorded his first career interception near midfield early in the second quarter. QB Spencer Rattler connected with WR Chris Olave for a three-yard TD late in the third quarter to reduce Buffalo's lead to 21-16, followed by a Blake Grupe field goal early in the fourth quarter. But the Bills answered with a four-play, 60-yard drive to gain a nine-point advantage. This was followed by a Saints drive that stalled at the Buffalo 43 on downs and the Bills then took advantage of a roughing the punter penalty to hold onto the ball and kick a field goal with 2:12 left.

Week 5: Saints 26, New York Giants 14; October 5, 2025 @ Caesars Superdome - Spencer Rattler was so fired up by the sight of Rashid Shaheed hauling in his deep throw down the right sideline that the second-year quarterback started springing the length of the field to join the celebration.

Rattler's pivotal completion to Shaheed went for an 87-yard touchdown, DB Jordan Howden returned a fumble 86 yards for a score, and New Orleans defeated the turnover-prone Giants 26-14 for the Saints' first win under rookie coach Kellen Moore.

"Probably the fastest I ran all game," Rattler quipped when asked about chasing Rashid to the end zone. "Those plays create energy for the whole team, the whole crowd and we definitely want to have more of those."

Such moments had been rare for New Orleans since late last season, which ended with the Saints on a four-game skid before the Moore era began with four more losses to start the 2025 season.

That changed Sunday against the Giants (1-4) - also the previous team to lose to the Saints last Dec. 8. And after the game, the Saints transformed their home locker room - equipped with a sound system and color-changing LED lighting - into "Club Dub" for the first time since beating Cleveland on Nov. 17. "It's been a while since we had the fog and the music playing afterward," Howden said. "I almost forgot how that was."

The 37-year old Moore celebrated his first victory since last season's Super Bowl - a game also played in the Caesars Superdome, when he was Philadelphia's offensive coordinator.

"This is a special group," Moore said, praising Saints players' "resiliency to hang in there through some challenging times the first month."

Rattler earned his first victory in 11 career starts, passing for 225 yards without turning the ball over or taking a sack, while Shaheed finished with four catches for 114 yards for the Saints (1-4).

"It feels good to get that first win," Rattler said. "It was a team win. The defense played great. The offensive line was elite."

Giants rookie QB Jaxson Dart, who won his first career start in Week 4, passed for 202 yards and two TDs, but also turned the ball over three times, the first when the ball slipped from his hand during a scramble in the third quarter.

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DE Cameron Jordan recovered as Dart, laying across Jordan's legs, disgustedly put both hands over his face.

"We had a lot of opportunities and moved the ball just fine," Dart said. "We hurt ourselves. We just kind of gave this game away."

Dart threw his first two career interceptions in the fourth quarter - both caught by Kool-Aid McKinstry for his first career picks.

New York committed five turnovers in all, none more costly than when RB Cam Skattebo was stripped by DT Bryan Bresee at the Saints 12-yard line, giving Howden the chance to scoop the loose ball on the 14 and sprint untouched the other way early in the fourth quarter.

"It was a game-changing play," Moore said.

Indeed, the Giants were threatening to score a go-ahead touchdown when Howden saw the ball on the ground behind the line of scrimmage, picked it up and recalled thinking, "Just run - run for my life."

Dart completed his first five passes for 44 yards, capped by his short TD pass to TE Theo Johnson. He mixed in a 20-yard scramble with three more completions during New York's next series, which ended with Dart's 15-yard strike to Johnson for a 14-3 lead.

New Orleans closed to 14-13 on Shaheed's TD - the Saints' longest offensive play since Drew Brees connected with Brandin Cooks for a 98-yard score in 2016.

Shaheed said he tried to make S Tyler Nubin believe he was headed across the field to the left, "and once I saw his hips turn, I broke toward the [right] corner and the rest is history.

It was also Shaheed's sixth career touchdown reception of 53 or more yards, and his third covering at least 68 yards.

After Saints K Blake Grupe missed a 52-yard field goal that would have given New Orleans the lead late in the first half, the Saints got the ball back when LB Demario Davis forced receiver Darius Slayton's fumble at the Saints 35 and S Jonas Sanker recovered.

That led to Grupe's short field goal for a 16-14 Saints lead at halftime.

Week 6: New England Patriots 26, Saints 19; October 12, 2025 @ Caesars Superdome - It's not the fight, it's the finish.

It's not the play it's the precision.

It's not the drive, it's the discipline and details.

The New Orleans Saints [1-5] lost their third one-score game this season on Sunday in the Caesars Superdome, falling 25-19 to New England.

Add that to earlier losses against Arizona [20-13] and San Francisco [26-21] and the Saints have riddled themselves with "couldas" and "wouldas," not not filled the holes with finished business

"Tough," cornerback Alontae Taylor said. "I think it speaks volumes for us, though. Teams ain't just blowing us out like we're just trash. I think we're right there, and we've just got to find that hump and just stay consistent with that and try to get some wins under our belt."

Sunday followed a similar pattern.

Quarterback Spencer Rattler was efficient and turnover-free - 20 of 26 for 227 yards with no interceptions, but no touchdowns. New Orleans split success in its two red zone trips - a short field goal by Blake Grupe and a one-yard touchdown run by Taysom Hill - and settled for field goals when drives stalled at the New England 30-, 20- and 36-yard lines.

Grupe's last field goal, a 54-yarder with 13:41 left, pulled New Orleans to within 25-19. And the defense, which struggled while allowing the Patriots to convert six of 13 times on third down, forced punts on consecutive New England possessions.

The Saints began their final two possessions at their own 25- and 10-yard lines. The first ended after two plays when tight end Juwan Johnson caught a pass from Rattler over the middle and lost a fumble after a 14-yard gain to the 50, and the second ended after the offense gained 28 yards on five plays.

The Patriots converted one last third down on their final drive - a 21-yard pass on third-and-11 from their own 30-yard line with 2:40 left - that allowed them to run out the clock.

New England quarterback Drake Maye [18 of 26 for 261 yards and three touchdowns, with no interceptions] had completions of fourth-and-four and third-and-11 [twice] in the second half, while all three touchdown passes came on first down in the first half.

"You're guarding pretty good receivers," Taylor said, noting Maye's ability to extend plays and five receivers extra time to uncover. "They're finding ways, and Drake and them have a pretty good connection."

"So you're just going to find a guy open and throw the ball. We've just got to tightend up on our end. if we've got to cover longer, then we've got to cover longer."

Even though the Patriots didn't convert the game's lone turnover into points, they siphoned 2:45 off the clock and pinned New Orleans deep with a punt. The Saints took possession at their 10 with 5:51 left.

"It says in the Word, like, don't get tired in doing good," Johnson said. "We have a lot of stuff that we're doing that's good, so don't get tired in doing it. You're going to be rewarded when the time is right. The time isn't right, but one thing we're going to do is just keep working, clean up a few things and that's where we're at."

"Our red zone efficiency needs to be a little better, that's something we're going to clean up and be a little more efficient. I had a turnover, so obviously clean that up."

"The biggest thing is just being better and sound. It's just little things that a lot of people don't see, but we see. We'll clean up, we'll do better, we'll come out with a better attitude and a different result next week."

Several winning elements have been displayed. The Saints continue the quest to minimize - if not eliminate the costly ones.

"At the end of the day we didn't take advantage of the opportunities that were presented to us," Coach Kellen Moore said. "Every game is going to have those opportunities, and you've got to take advantage of them. They won the turnover ratio, they won some of the situational stuff and that's how this game was decided."

"I've got to find a way for myself to coach better, to put myself in better situations to be more successful as a football team. Because there's too much good and not enough in those little margins."

Week 7: Chicago Bears 26, Saints 14; October 19, 2025 @ Soldier Field - The piecemeal approach to winning NFL games continued to fail the New Orleans Saints on Sunday in Chicago.

Flashes of effectiveness [defensive stops, a forced turnover, two impressive touchdown drives] again could not sufficiently puncture a thicker shield of futility [four turnovers, no run game against the Bears, inability to stop the run], and the Saints dropped their sixth game in seven outings, 26-14 to the Bears at Soldier Field.

A promising defensive start included a three-and-out punt to open the game, a field goal allowed after the offense committed a turnover deep in New Orleans territory and an interception off Bears QB Caleb Williams. But that buckled under the weight of 222 rushing yards and two touchdowns allowed on 40 carries.

And an offensive flurry that produced consecutive touchdown drives of 91 and 80 yards, each ending on passes from QB Spencer Rattler to WR Chris Olave, was negated by four Rattler turnovers and an invisible run game [44 yards on 17 carries].

Saints first-year coach Kellen Moore echoed the sound of sameness to explain the outcome.

"The theme of that game...we had our chances," Moore said. "I thought our guys battled. I thought our guys put [us] in really good position in the middle of the game to come back and get ourself back in it. But then we just couldn't keep it going. Credit to those guys - they played better than us, they coached better than us. We've got to find the formula that works."

New Orleans has shown it has the ability to create the elements of the formula. It hasn't been able to create them consistently and sustain them long enough for the scoreboard to reflect the mix.

Rattler [20 of 32 for 233 yards and two TDs, and sacked four times for -24 yards] had been masterful in his caretaking the first six games. He entered Sunday with one turnover - an interception almost a month ago against Seattle - and six touchdowns. But he was sacked and lost a fumble on the Saints' opening possession, after New Orleans' defense forced a punt on the game's opening drive. And after the Saints punted and Blake Grupe missed his sixth field goal this season to end the second and third drives, Rattler's pass intended for Mason Tipton was intercepted and returned to the Saints 30-yard line to conclude the fourth drive.

Week 8: Tampa Bay Buccaneers 23, Saints 3; October 26, 2025 @ Caesars Superdome - An inspired defensive effort and a quarterback change wasn't enough for the New Orleans Saints on Sunday, as they dropped a 23-3 decision to the Tampa Bay Buccaneers at the Caesars Superdome.

The Saints turned the ball over four times (two interceptions, one a pick-six) to allow the Bucs to solidify their grip on the NFC South at 6-2. The loss dropped the Saints to 1-7.

Rookie Tyler Shough entered the game with 3:57 to play in the third quarter and the Saints down 17-3 and promptly completed his first pass for six yards to Taysom Hill. Shough's first series ended when Tampa safety Antoine Winfield Jr. took the ball away from Saints receiver Chris Olave for an interception. Starter Spencer Rattler was 15 of 21 for 136 yards with a lost fumble and pick-six, leading the Saints to just three points (48-yard Blake Grupe field goal). Shough finished 17 of 30 for 129 yards.

The Saints defense played exceptional football in the first half, not allowing the Bucs' offense to score while sacking quarterback Baker Mayfield three times and forcing him to fumble once. Tampa had just 80 yards of offense in the first half. The Saints defense also had a goal-line stand and came close to a second one before Tampa scored on a 1-yard dive in the third quarter.

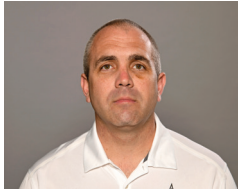
Saints running back Alvin Kamara joined another exclusive list Sunday when he became the fifth running back in NFL history to have 600 or more receptions. He entered Sunday's game against the Tampa Bay Buccaneers needing two receptions to hit the milestone and accomplished that in the final minute of the second quarter. He had two receptions for 24 yards and six carries for 21 yards.

Luke Fortner started at center for the Saints, replacing longtime starter Erik McCoy, who is out for the season with a biceps injury. Running back Devin Neal saw his most extensive action of the season as the Saints played without Kendre Miller, who was lost for the season in Week Seven because of a knee injury. Rashid Shaheed had nine receptions for 75 yards and Chris Olave added eight grabs for 63 yards.

ON DECK

The Saints will travel to Charlotte to face the Carolina Panthers on Sunday, November 9 at 12:00 p.m. CT. New Orleans is 31-29 in the regular season against the Panthers and also captured the 2017 NFC Wild Card playoff. The two clubs have split the last eight meetings dating back to 2021. The clubs split the series in 2024, with each team capturing their home matchups.

COORDINATOR CORNER


**SPECIAL TEAMS COORD.
PHIL GALIANO**

Phil Galiano is in his first season as the Saints' special teams coordinator and his seventh campaign in New Orleans, spending his first six years as the club's assistant special teams coach. Galiano is a veteran in the coaching ranks with 25 years of experience, including nine seasons in the NFL.

Galiano's work over the past six years with Darren Rizzi, who served as coordinator from 2019-24, helped make the kicking game an important key to victory for New Orleans. On coverage units, J.T. Gray's 93 tackles rank first in the NFL, with the special teams ace selected as an *Associated Press* All-Pro three times. The punting game has produced the top five seasons in club history for punts inside-the-20-yard line. Since 2019, the Saints have excelled in the return game. Over the six-season period, the team has been ranked fifth in the NFL in punt return average (10.4) and are tied for second in the league with three punts returned for touchdowns. The coverage units have allowed the third-lowest punt return average (7.0).

Special teams continued to be a bright spot for New Orleans in 2024, highlighted by Gray being selected as an All-Pro after recording an NFL-best 26 coverage tackles and one blocked punt. New Orleans ranked first in the NFL in opponent starting field position after kickoffs (28.2), punts inside-the-20 yard line (franchise-record 41), fifth in punt return average (12.5), seventh in opponent field goal percentage (78.6), eighth in opponent punt return average (7.6) and tenth in field goal percentage (87.1). Two blocked field goals were crucial in a pair of three-point victories. K Blake Grupe made 27-of-31 field goal attempts, six-of-eight from 50+ yards, an 87.1 percentage and scored 112 points. WR/RS Rashid Shaheed returned a punt for a touchdown for the second consecutive season.

A three-year starter at safety for Shippensburg, Galiano served as a tri-captain during his senior campaign. He helped lead the Raiders to consecutive winning seasons (1997-99). The Norristown, Pa. native graduated a degree in business administration.

COORDINATOR CORNER


**OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR
DOUG NUSSMEIER**

Doug Nussmeier is in his first season as the Saints' offensive coordinator and tenth campaign as a coach in the National Football League. A 24-year coaching veteran, Nussmeier returns to New Orleans after originally being a fourth round pick (116th overall) of the Saints in the 1994 NFL Draft out of Idaho.

Nussmeier joins the Saints after spending the 2024 season as quarterbacks coach of the Philadelphia Eagles under Saints Head Coach Kellen Moore, who served as offensive coordinator, where he proved to be a key piece of their Super Bowl LIX Champion offensive coaching staff. Jalen Hurts flourished under Nussmeier's tutelage, posting a career-high 103.7 passer rating, fifth in the league and tying for the fifth-most rushing touchdowns (14) in the league (first among quarterbacks).

Nussmeier rejoined the NFL with the Dallas Cowboys in 2018, after previously spending two seasons with the St. Louis Rams from 2006-07 as quarterbacks coach. After serving on the Cowboys staff from 2018-22, he served as quarterbacks coach of the Los Angeles Chargers in 2023. In between, he spent 13 seasons coaching at the collegiate level, where he tutored eight different players who were selected in the first or second round of the NFL Draft.

Nussmeier finished his career at the University of Idaho as the program's all-time leading passer with 10,824 career passing yards over five years (1989-93). He won the Walter Payton Award in 1993, which was at the time given annually to the top player in NCAA Division 1-AA after throwing for a program-record 33 touchdown passes and leading the Vandals to a national semifinal berth. Nussmeier was named Big Sky Conference Offensive Player of the Year in 1992 and was inducted into the University of Idaho Athletic Hall of Fame in 2008.

A Portland, Ore. native, Nussmeier and his wife, Christi, have two sons, Garrett and Colton, and a daughter, Ashlynn. Garrett is in his fifth season as a quarterback at LSU.

COORDINATOR CORNER


**DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR
BRANDON STALEY**

Brandon Staley is in his first season as the Saints' defensive coordinator. Staley is a 19-year coaching veteran with three as head coach of the Los Angeles Chargers.

This will be Staley's second stint as a defensive coordinator after leading the Los Angeles Rams to finish first in the NFL in total defense in 2020.

Staley arrived in New Orleans after serving most recently as assistant coach/defense of the San Francisco 49ers in 2024. Working with multiple position groups, as well as aiding 49ers Head Coach Kyle Shanahan, the San Francisco defense finished the season ranked eighth in the NFL in opponent net yards per game (317.4) and fifth against the pass (192.8 ypg.). DL Nick Bosa was selected to the Pro Bowl after recording nine sacks, one interception, one forced fumble and one recovery. ILB Fred Warner was selected to the Pro Bowl, Associated Press All-Pro and PFWA All-NFL, as he registered 131 tackles (76 solo), two interceptions returned for 70 yards, including a 45-yard touchdown return and four forced fumbles. Saints CB Issac Yiadom led the team with a career-high three takeaways.

During his tenure as Chargers head coach, Staley led Los Angeles to a 24-24 record and guided the franchise to its first postseason appearance since the 2018 season. In his final season with the Chargers (2023), Staley helped QB Justin Herbert continue one of the best starts to a career in NFL history as no quarterback has more completions or passing yards over the first four seasons of a career than Herbert. Staley also saw WR Keenan Allen and LB Khalil Mack put together career seasons and earn themselves nods to the Pro Bowl Games roster. Before becoming an NFL coach, Staley spent 11 seasons coaching at the collegiate level. In 2016, Staley earned National Coordinator of the Year honors for Division III.

A native of Perry, Ohio, Staley played collegiately as a quarterback at the University of Dayton for four seasons (2001-04) before finishing at Division II Mercyhurst College in 2005. He and his wife Amy, have three sons, Colin, Will and Grant.

Joel Thomas, a 25-year coaching veteran, returns to New Orleans to tutor the clubs running backs in 2025. He previously spent nine years with the Black and Gold (2015-23). After spending the 2024 season coaching the New York Giants running backs, the Port Angeles, Wash. native returns to New Orleans with a additional title of associate head coach.

During Thomas' initial nine-year tenure in tutoring the Saints running backs, the Black and Gold tied for second in the NFL with 161 rushing touchdowns and his backs registered 25 individual 100-yard performances. Under his tutelage, Alvin Kamara, the Saints' all-time rushing yardage leader, earned five consecutive Pro Bowl selections (2017-21) and was the only NFL player with at least 1,160 total yards from scrimmage in each of the seven seasons he first coached him, three of them 1,500 or more.

In 2023 under Thomas, Kamara became the franchise's all-time leader in yards from scrimmage, rushing touchdowns and total touchdowns. Thomas also coached Mark Ingram II, New Orleans' all-time rushing leader from 2021-24 (6,500 yards), for six years, including two 1,000-yard campaigns. During Thomas' first New Orleans tenure, the Saints ranked in the top six in the NFL in rushing three times (2017, 2018 and 2020).

With the Giants in 2024, Thomas oversaw the development of rookie tailback Tyrone Tracy Jr., a fifth round pick. Tracy earned PFWA All-Rookie when he carried 192 times for 839 yards (4.4 avg.) with five TDs to rank second among NFL rookies for the season and New York rookies all-time in rushing yards. He added 38 receptions for 284 yards with one TD to tally 1,123 yards from scrimmage, the fifth-highest total among NFL rookies in 2024 and fourth among Giants rookies all-time.

Thomas lettered as a running back at Idaho from 1993-98 and still holds Vandals career records with 3,929 rushing yards and 51 touchdowns. He was inducted into the University of Idaho Athletic Hall of Fame in 2008. Thomas earned his degree in communications in 1998.

Thomas and his wife, Ebbie, have two boys, Teyo and Niko.

Numerous Saints players, coaches and administrators are not the only members of their families to make a name for themselves in pro football. 22 Saints players, coaches or front office staff have relatives who have played, coached or served in the front office in the NFL.

Tight Ends Coach Chase Haslett - Father, Jim Haslett, played linebacker for the Buffalo Bills from 1979-85 and finished his playing career with the New York Jets in 1986. Haslett was an assistant for the Los Angeles Raiders, Saints, Pittsburgh Steelers, St. Louis Rams, Washington Redskins, Cincinnati Bengals and Tennessee Titans and was head coach of the Saints from 2000-05, where he guided the franchise to their first playoff victory in 2000 and was named NFL Coach of the Year.

Defensive Pass Game Coordinator Terry Joseph - Cousin Vance Joseph is currently defensive coordinator of the Denver Broncos, was their head coach from 2017-18 and has also been an assistant coach with six other teams, after also playing for the New York Jets and Indianapolis Colts. Younger cousin, Sammy, played for the San Francisco 49ers in 2007.

Senior VP/Asst. GM-College Personnel Jeff Ireland - Stepson of Chiefs Hall of Fame linebacker/center E.J. Holub. Grandson of Eagles running back and Bears personnel executive Jim Parmer.

National Scout Terry Wooden - Brother, JoJo, has been a longtime scout in the NFL Player Personnel ranks.

Run Game Coordinator T.J. Paganetti - Brother, Ryan, has coached with the Philadelphia Eagles and Jacksonville Jaguars. He is currently the Head Coach Research Specialist of the Las Vegas Raiders.

Edges Coach Jay Rodgers - Brother, Jeff, is a longtime NFL assistant who is currently assistant head coach/special teams coordinator for the Arizona Cardinals.

Linebackers Coach Peter Sirmon - Son, Jackson, currently plays for the New York Jets.

Assistant Wide Receivers Coach Kyle Valero - Father, Art, was an NFL assistant for ten years.

ROSTER ROLL CALL

On the Saints active roster as of September 22, 30 were on the active roster, a reserve list of the practice squad at the end of the 2024 season. Among newcomers, the roster includes six unrestricted free agents, two waiver acquisitions, four veteran free agents, four trade acquisitions, six draft picks and two rookie free agents.

Of the players, 43 have less than four years of previous NFL experience, including 12 rookies. 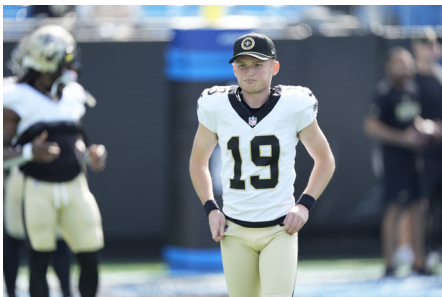

BUCKING THE ODDS

The Saints have a long tradition of finding players as free agents signed after the draft that make an impact immediately or after developing their careers initially on the practice squad. Several undrafted Saints on the roster have played key roles on offense, defense and special teams.

Over the past 22 years, the Saints [2018-22: DB **J.T. Gray**, WR/RS **Deonte Harty** and WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed**] and San Diego/Los Angeles Chargers [2003: G **Kris Dielman**, TE **Antonio Gates** and WR **Kasim Osgood**] are the only two teams to have three players signed as undrafted free agents be selected to a Pro Bowl for the team that originally signed them.



Joining New Orleans following the 2023 NFL Draft after a graduate transfer season at Notre Dame and playing the first four years of his college career at Arkansas State, K **Blake Grupe** won a pre-season competition to handle placekicking duties and in three seasons, has drilled 72-of-89 field goal attempts [80.9 pct.], including 27-of-31 kicks [87.1 pct.] in 2024 with a career-long of 57 yards in the season-opening win over Carolina. Grupe drilled two 50+ yard kicks through the uprights in two contests in 2024.

DE **Carl Granderson** joined the club in 2019 as an undrafted free agent out of Wyoming and has appeared in 96 games with 47 starts, posting 271 tackles [159 solo], 33 sacks for a loss of 202.5 yards, eight pass breakups, four forced fumbles and two recoveries, one blocked field goal and one blocked extra point. In 2025, Granderson has been hot from the start, recording 31 tackles [21 solo], a team-high 4.5 sacks and two pass breakups. Granderson is tied for 16th in the NFL in quarterback takedowns. In the first two games of the season, he recorded more than one sack.



An integral part of the offense and return game, through the first six games in 2024 before suffering a season-ending knee injury vs. Tampa Bay, Oct. 13, Shaheed had 20 receptions for 349 yards [17.5 avg.] with touchdowns of 43-, 59- and 70 yards, carried six times for 29 yards, returned nine punts for a league-best 143 yards [NFL-high 15.9 avg.] and six kickoffs for 171 yards [28.5 avg.]. Rashid’s 15.9 punt return average ranked first in the NFL and his 692 all-purpose yards fourth. Overall, since coming into the league in 2022, his 15 catches of 40 yards or more rank third in the NFL.

With his second career punt return on a 54-yard run-back on Oct. 13, 2024 vs. Tampa Bay, Shaheed joined Reggie Bush [4] and Tyrone Hughes [2] as only the third Saint with multiple punt returns for touchdowns.

In 2025, a healthy Shaheed has provided a spark both on offense and in the return game. In the first eight contests all of which he has started, he has recorded 39 receptions for 431 yards [11.1 avg.] with two touchdowns and in the return game, he has brought back nine punts for 120 yards [13.3 avg.], including a 40-yard runback. He has helped New Orleans rank eighth in the NFL in punt return average.

TE **Juwan Johnson** first led Saints tight ends with four touchdown receptions in 2021, converting to the position that offseason after playing wideout in college and as a rookie in 2020, he signed as an undrafted free agent from Oregon. Johnson led Saints tight ends with a career-high 50 receptions for a club-best 548 yards in 2024, adding three touchdown grabs. He has led the Saints with 15 receiving touchdowns over the past four seasons, tied for sixth over that period among NFL tight ends. In his career, Johnson has played in 75 games (41 starts), making 182 receptions for 1,990 yards with 19 TDs.

In 2025, Johnson is seventh among tight ends in receiving and sixth in receiving yards with 36 grabs for 368 yards with one touchdown. His 178 receptions as a tight end (four additional were as a WR in 2020) are fourth among the position all-time for the club.

Signing following the 2025 NFL Draft, G **Torricelli Simpkins III** started all 48 games along the offensive lines at North Carolina Central [2021-23] and South Carolina [2024]. After playing the first three seasons of his career at NCCU, where he was a third-team All-American in 2023, he transferred to USC in 2024. He opened all 13 games at right guard for the Gamecocks and received third-team All-SEC. He competed on all three interior positions in training camp and secured a roster spot based on his play in preseason games. Simpkins received his first career start at left guard at Seattle, Sept. 21, saw extensive action at right guard, Sept. 28 at Buffalo and started at right guard in the Oct. 5 victory over the New York Giants, where the offensive line did not give up a sack.

Signing following the 2024 NFL Draft, LB **Isaiah Stalbird** played at Nebraska [2019] and South Dakota State [2020-23]. He played in 64 games and made 251 tackles, 18.5 for loss, three sacks, an interception, 19 pass breakups, five forced fumbles, two recoveries and three blocked punts for the 2022 and 2023 FCS National Champions. Through eight games in 2025, Stallbird has a team-high nine coverage stops and added a career-high two tackles on Sunday vs. Tampa Bay.

WR **Mason Tipton** stuck on the 53-man roster in 2024 after showing bright spots in the preseason following a college career at Yale, where he posted 132 receptions for 1,067 yards with 19 touchdowns. In 2024, he had 14 receptions for 99 yards. In the 2025 preseason, Tipton led the team in all receiving categories with eight receptions for 158 yards [19.8 avg.] with one touchdown, ranking fifth in the league in receiving yardage. On Oct. 12, against New England, he returned four kickoffs for 89 yards., both career-highs.

DRAFT HISTORY

The New Orleans Saints 2025 draft class, the first under first-year Head Coach Kellen Moore features six-of-nine players currently contributing to the team’s 53-man roster, three offensive players, as well as three defenders, with three [T Kelvin Banks Jr., S Jonas Sanker and CB Quincy Riley] starting on Sunday at the Chicago Bears, including Riley recording his first career interception. On offense, Executive VP/General Manager Mickey Loomis split the selections among four different positions. Defensively, New Orleans added players at four different positions as the unit makes the switch to Defensive Coordinator Brandon Staley’s 3-4 scheme, a safety, a linebacker and a cornerback currently contributing. With Riley recording a pick in Week Seven and Sanker posting one in Week Four, this is the first time since 2019, that two Saints rookie defenders have recorded interceptions.

FROM THE FIELD TO THE SIDELINE

Kellen Moore is the seventh New Orleans Saints head coach to have played in the National Football League, joining Tom Fears, John North, Dick Nolan, Mike Ditka, Jim Haslett and Sean Payton. Moore, who finished his college playing career at Boise State with a record of 50-3, the most wins by a quarterback in NCAA history, played six seasons for the Detroit Lions (2012-14) and Dallas Cowboys (2015-17).

**BARKING UP THE RIGHT TREE**

With Moore as his offensive coordinator in 2024 with the Eagles, Philadelphia running back Saquon Barkley had one of the best seasons by a tailback in NFL history. The consensus National Football League Offensive Player of the Year, a first-team *Associated Press* All-Pro and Pro Bowl starter selection, Barkley led the league with a franchise-record 2,005 rushing yards in the regular season, making him just the ninth player in NFL history to post 2,000+ rushing yards in a season, eight-most in league records. Including 499 rushing yards in the playoffs which ranked third all-time, Barkley's 2,504 rushing yards were the most in NFL single-season history (regular season and postseason combined).

NOTHING HURTS

In 2024 in Philadelphia, under the tutelage of Moore who served as offensive coordinator and Saints Offensive Coordinator Doug Nussmeier, who was quarterbacks coach, Eagles signal-caller Jalen Hurts was able to put together one of the best seasons of his career. The Super Bowl Most Valuable Player ranked among the top eight in the league in yards per attempt (fourth, 8.0), passer rating (fifth, career-high 103.7), completion percentage (eight, career-high 6.7 pct.) and total touchdowns (32, eighth). In Super Bowl LIX, Hurts completed 17-of-22 passes (77.3 pct.) for 221 yards, two touchdowns, a 119.7 passer rating and 72 rushing yards with one touchdown on the ground, the most rushing yards by a signal-caller ever in a Super Bowl.

The Saints hold a 5-1 record on Nov. 2, defeating the St. Louis Cardinals, the Atlanta Falcons (twice) and the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. New Orleans’ loss was against the this week’s opponent, the Rams in 1980. In 1969, the club’s first Nov. 2 game, the Saints put up the franchise’s first 50-point output in a 51-42 victory over the Cardinals at Busch Stadium. In 2009, the last Nov. 2 meeting, Saints defeated the Falcons 35-27 on Monday Night Football in the Superdome, as the Saints improved to 5-0 on the season, in a campaign, where they would start 13-0 and capture Super Bowl XLIV.

FIVE STRAIGHT

In the Oct. 26-14 win over the New York Giants, the Saints recorded takeaways off five consecutive Giants possessions. This was the first time this occurred in an NFL game since the Kansas City Chiefs intercepted Jets QB Ryan Fitzpatrick on the last five Jets possessions of the contest in a 24-3 Chiefs win on Sept. 25, 2016. It was the first time the Saints had defensive takeaways on five consecutive possessions, since they had five straight interceptions in a 27-3 win at the Phoenix Cardinals on Dec. 22, 1991. STOPPING THE RUN

After surrendering 4.92 yards per carry in 2024, which ranked 31st in the NFL, the Saints have tightened up their interior run defense in 2025, giving up only 4.02 rushing yards per play, ranked 12th in the league. New Orleans’ rise up the rankings was helped by a standout run defense performance on Sunday vs. Tampa Bay, when they gave up only 88 yards rushing on 29 attempts [3.0 avg.].



GOAL LINE STANDS

In Sunday’s contest against Tampa Bay, the Saints succeeded in a pair of short yardage situations against tall odds. In the second quarter, with the Buccaneers having first and one at the Saints one-yard line, the New Orleans front seven stopped Buccaneers RB Rachaad White from entering the end zone on three straight plays, with DE Chris Rumph II and DT Nathan Shepherd stuffing Tampa Bay RB Sean Tucker on fourth-and-one. In Tampa Bay’s first drive of the third quarter, the Buccaneers advanced to the New Orleans one-yard line following a 22-yard completion from QB Baker Mayfield to TE Cade Otton. On a pair of goal line plays, CB Kool-Aid McKinstry successfully defended Mayfield pass attempts to wideouts Sterling Shepard and Emeka Egbuka. On second down, LB Demario Davis stuffed Tucker. Until Tucker reached the end zone on fourth and one, the Saints had successfully defended the one-yard line seven times in the contest, the first time a team had done so since the December 8, 2013 matchup where Tennessee Titans managed seven stops from the one-yard line by the Denver Broncos [credit-ESPN] at Empower Field at Mile High.



With five takeaways on Oct. 5, against the New York Giants taking place on five consecutive possessions, the Saints have shot to near the top of the NFL’s team takeaway list.

DRAFT CONTRIBUTORS

The team's top three selections in the 2024 NFL Draft started multiple games for the Saints in 2024. Below is a summary of the performance of five of the top six 2024 draft picks, as each of them of them look to make a jump in 2025:

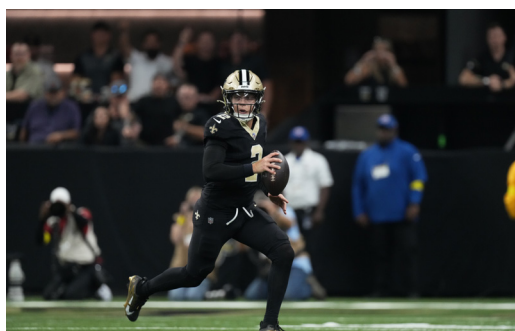


RT Taliese Fuaga, Oregon State [D1] - Selected with the 14th overall pick out of Oregon State, the Saints were able to address an immediate need, while also acquiring a building block for the future. Fuaga was an anchor on the Saints offensive line in his rookie campaign, seamlessly moving over to the left tackle position for his first NFL season, where he opened every game for an offense that improved in every rushing metric. Starting all 17 games, he was the first Saint to start every game in his rookie year at the offensive line's most challenging position since J.T. Taylor in 1978. Now in 2025, Fuaga has moved back to his natural right tackle position. After missing the Week Three contest at Seattle, he returned to the lineup in Week Four and helped spur a run game that gained a season-high 189 yards. On October 5, against the New York Giants, he anchored an offensive line that kept QB Spencer Rattler's jersey clean and did not give up a sack.



CB Kool-Aid McKinstry, Alabama [D2] - Selected in the second round of the 2024 NFL Draft with the 41st overall pick out of Alabama, McKinstry arrived in New Orleans having covered many of the nation's top wideouts in the Southeastern Conference for the last three years.

In 2023, the consensus first-team All-American was a semifinalist for the Jim Thorpe Award, making 32 tackles and seven passes defended. In New Orleans, McKinstry played in 15 games with nine starts, moving into the starting lineup in Week Eight and recorded 44 tackles with seven pass breakups, often tasked with covering an opponent's top wideout. Through the first eight contests/starts of 2025, he has recorded 33 tackles (29 solo) with, two interceptions and a club-best seven pass breakups, recording the first two picks of his career in the October 5 win over the New York Giants, capturing NFC Defensive Player of the Week honors for the first time in his career. On Sunday vs. Tampa Bay, McKinstry played an important role in holding the Buccaneers to 124 net yards passing. In 23 career games with 17 starts, he has career totals of 74 stops (60 solo), two picks, 14 pass breakups and one special teams tackle.



QB Spencer Rattler, South Carolina [D5a] - Selected with the team's first selection in the fifth round (150th overall) out of South Carolina, Rattler completed 900-of-1,313 passes (68.5 pct.) for 10,807 yards with 77 touchdowns, and only 32 interceptions for the Gamecocks (2022-23) and Oklahoma (2019-21).

As a rookie, Rattler played in seven games with six starts, he completed 130-of-228 passes for a Saints rookie-record 1,317 yards with four touchdowns, also carrying 18 times for 146 yards.

After opening the most games by a Saints rookie signal-caller since Archie Manning in 1971, Rattler captured the starting position in a preseason competition. In the 2025 season opener vs. Arizona on Sept. 7, Rattler completed 27 passes for 214 yards, while carrying four times for 29 yards, while leading his team to the Cardinals 18-yard line for three pass attempts to potentially tie a 20-13 Cardinals lead.

SAINTS AT RAMS

Rattler took another big step forward on Sept. 14, vs. San Francisco, when he completed 25-of-34 passes [73.5 pct.] for 207 yards with three touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 118.1 passer rating. Rattler also carried four times for 14 yards, including a nine-yard scramble on third-and-nine. He set career-bests for completion percentage, touchdown passes and passer rating.

Rattler led the Black and Gold to his first victory as a starter on October 5 vs. the New York Giants, when he completed 21-of-31 passes [67.7 pct.] for 225 yards with a career-long 87-yard touchdown pass to WR Rashid Shaheed, tied for the fifth-longest play from scrimmage in franchise history and a 99.5 passer rating.

On Sunday, October 12, vs. New England, Rattler completed 20-of-26 passes [career-high 76.9 pct.] for 227 yards with a career-high 8.73 yards per attempt and a 102.6 passer rating. Rattler also carried four times for 20 yards.

On the season, Rattler has completed 173-of-256 passes [67.6 pct.] for 1,586 yards with eight touchdowns, five interceptions and an 86.8 passer rating. Rattler has also utilized his feet, carrying 31 times for 167 yards [5.4 avg.].



LB Jaylan Ford, Texas [D5c] - The last of three fifth round draft picks by the club in 2024, Ford was selected out of Texas, where during he posted 287 tackles, 27.5 stops for loss, three sacks, ten pass breakups, six interceptions, four forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries. As a rookie, Ford established a role on special teams, contributing five tackles before suffering a fibula injury in Week 17. Ford is expected to comprise a role as a core special teams player in 2025, making six stops, after recording three on October 19, at Chicago.



DT Khristian Boyd, Northern Iowa [D6] - A sixth round selection, Boyd appeared in 49 career games in college and collected 149 tackles [59 solo], 22.5 stops for loss, 10.5 sacks, five pass breakups and two forced fumbles.

In his final college season, Boyd started all 11 games along the defensive line and had 43 stops [17 solo], 6.5 tackles for loss, 3.5 sacks and a pass breakup, while earning All-Missouri Valley Football Conference first-team and consensus FCS third-team All-American. Following a full offseason, and utilizing his 6-2, 320-pound frame to fit into the Saints' 3-4 alignment under Staley, the Kansas City native led the Black and Gold with two sacks in the preseason, while providing a push up the team's interior defensive line. Boyd made his 2025 regular season debut in Week Four at Buffalo and finished with one tackle. On October 19 at Chicago, he finished with two stops.

LINING THEM UP



One of Head Coach Kellen Moore's first tasks was shoring up the alignment and the overall depth of the Saints offensive line- a unit that saw nine different starting combinations during the 2024 campaign. The line has gelled, now managing a season-long absence of Pro Bowl center Erik McCoy, who suffered a biceps injury in Week Seven.



A franchise that has consistently invested in the offensive line with four first round picks in the last six seasons, the past two campaigns have been no different. On the interior right guard **Cesar Ruiz** is the elder statesman, having been selected in the first round in 2020, having played in 82 regular season contests with 76 starts. In 2025, Ruiz has opened seven-of-eight contests, returning after missing only one game from a high ankle sprain.

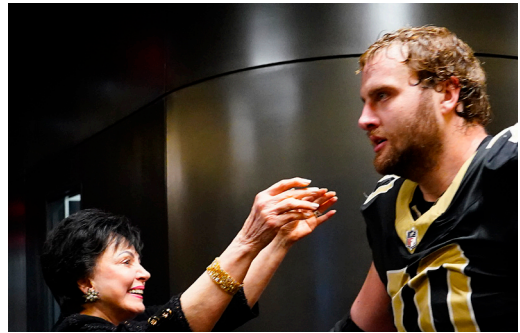
In three of the last four seasons, New Orleans has continued to fortify their offensive line, selecting left tackle **Kelvin Banks Jr.**, right tackle **Taliese Fuaga** and and left guard **Trevor Penning** with first round selections.



Banks, 6-5, 315, was selected with the ninth overall pick out of Texas this past April, the highest selection by the Black and Gold since 2005. A three-year starter who opened all 42 games he played in at left tackle for the Longhorns from 2022-24, Banks was the 2024 Outland Trophy winner and a unanimous All-American selection. In his first season, Banks has lined up at the position that he manned flawlessly as a college standout, facing weekly challenges from some of the NFL's elite pass rushers, a leading candidate for league All-Rookie honors.

2024 first round pick Fuaga, immediately moved into left tackle as a rookie after being a two-year starter at right tackle at Oregon State, earning first-team All-American in 2023.

In 2025, the Tacoma, Wash. native became the first Saints rookie to start every game at the position since J.T. Taylor in 1978. In 2025 for his second-team campaign, Fuaga has moved back to the right tackle position he manned in Corvallis.



2022 first round pick Penning opened all 17 games at right tackle in 2024 in his third pro season after playing left tackle his first two. Spending time at both tackle positions and right guard at Northern Iowa from 2018-21, he will utilize his toughness and physicality by slotting into left guard in 2025. He returned to action in Week Four after missing the first three contests with a toe injury.

Fortner is a former University of Kentucky stand-out who was a third round pick (65th overall) of the Jacksonville Jaguars out of Kentucky in 2022 and has started 35 of the 59 regular season games he has played and two postseason contests in 2023. Acquired by New Orleans in a preseason trade with the Jaguars following an exhibition game by the two clubs, Fortner has been called into action to manage the center position for the Black and Gold for the remainder of the 2025 campaign.

SPECIAL TEAMS OVERVIEW

Saints special teams will benefit from the elevation of Phil Galiano to coordinator, after serving as assistant special teams coach for the past five-and-a-half seasons before taking over coordination of the unit midway through the 2024 season. During Galiano's tenure, the special teams units have consistently ranked among the NFL's leaders in placekicking, coverage and return units, producing Pro Bowlers and AP All-Pros, also setting various club records in placekicking, punting, return game and coverage units.



PUNT RETURN GAME

Shaheed provided a spark to the punt return game prior to his season-ending knee injury in Week Six. He was on his way to being selected as a Pro Bowl starter as a return specialist and a first-team Associated Press All-Pro as a punt returner again. Shaheed is only the third Saint with multiple punt returns for touchdowns.

As a team, in 2024 New Orleans finished fifth in the NFL in team punt return average, one of five clubs to have a runback for a touchdown. With the 54-yard touchdown by Shaheed and the 53-yard runback by Dante Pettis, the Saints were the only team in the NFC and one of only two in the NFL in 2024 to have two punt returns of 50-or-more yards.

BLOCK UNIT

New Orleans’ field goal block unit came through big on three occasions in the second half of the 2024 season, two taking place in three-point victories. The field goal block unit’s hard work carried over into the 2025 season opener, as third-year defensive tackle Bryan Bresee blocked a fourth quarter 46-yard field goal attempt to give the offense the ball back for a drive where they ended up scoring a field goal.

In the first eight games of the season, Rattler has completed 173-of-256 passes [67.6 pct.] for 1,586 yards with eight touchdowns, only five interceptions and an 86.8 passer rating. On Oct. 5 against the New York Giants, he led the Saints to their first victory of the season, completing 21-of-31 passes [66.7 pct.] for 225 yards with a career-long 87-yard touchdown pass to WR Rashid Shaheed, tied for the fifth-longest play from scrimmage in franchise history, and a 99.5 passer rating. On Oct. 12, vs. New England, Rattler, completed 20-of-26 throws [career-high 76.9 pct.] for 227 yards with a 102.6 passer rating and a career-best 8.73 yards per attempt.

TYLER SHOUGH

With their eyes on competition and development, the New Orleans Saints selected Tyler Shough (last name pronounced Shuck) out of Louisville with the team’s selection in the second round (40th overall) of the 2025 NFL Draft. In seven seasons at Oregon [2018-20], Texas Tech [2021-23] and Louisville [2024], Shough played in 42 games and completed 599-of-951 passes [63.0 pct.] for 7,820 yards with 59 touchdowns, also carrying 246 times for 733 yards with 11 scores.

Shough relieved Rattler in the third quarter of Sundays’ contest vs. Tampa Bay and completed 17-of-30 passes for 128 yards and carried three times for 12 yards.

TAYSOM HILL



Hill has brought unheralded versatility to the Saints offense and special teams. He’s played in 109 games with 50 starts at several positions. He has carried 448 times for 2,439 yards, the most by a Saint not to play running back full-time, with 34 touchdowns, ranked fifth in club records. In the passing game, he has caught 102 passes for 961 yards with 11 touchdowns, completed 194-of-303 passes for 2,388 yards with 11 touchdowns, returned 20 kicks for 489 yards, made a defensive tackle, a forced fumble, 15 special teams tackles and blocked one punt. After suffering a season-ending knee injury in Week 13 of the 2024 season, Hill aggressively rehabbed to return to action in Week Four. On Dec. 12, vs. the New England Patriots, Hill scored his first rushing touchdown of the season on a one-yard run.

BY THE NUMBERS

1 - With 2,439 rushing yards, 2,388 passing yards and 961 receiving yards, Hill is the only NFL player in the Super Bowl era with 2,000 career passing yards, 2,000 career rushing yards and 900 career receiving yards.

2 - With his standout performance in the the November 17, 2024 35-14 win over Cleveland, Hill picked up his second NFC Offensive Player of the Week honors.

3 - Hill has picked up three conference player of the Week awards, including an NFC Special Teams Player of the Week honor in 2018 at Tampa Bay, when he blocked a punt, joining RB/RS Reggie Bush as only the second Saint to capture conference player of the Week honors in two phases.

5 - In 2023 and 2024, Hill saw action at five offensive positions [quarterback, fullback, tailback, tight end and wide receiver], as well as participating on special teams.

10 - With 11 career touchdown passes, 11 career receiving touchdowns and 34 career rushing touchdowns, Hill is the first player to have at least ten career passing touchdowns, ten career receiving touchdowns and ten career rushing touchdowns since Frank Gifford [Pro Football Hall of Fame Class of 1977].

33 - Hill's 33 receptions in 2023 set a career-high. In 2024, he had 18 grabs after setting a career-high with eight catches vs. Cleveland on Nov. 17.

34 - Hill's 34 career rushing touchdowns are ranked fifth in record books.

45 - Hill has 45 career touchdowns, ranked ninth in club record books.

47 - Hill brought back his first career NFL kickoff return 47 yards in a 21-18 win over the Cleveland Browns on Sept. 16, 2018, the longest of his career. In part-time kickoff return duty, he has brought back 20 kicks for 489 yards [24.5 avg.], including a 42-yard runback in the Nov. 17, 2024 win over Cleveland.

575 - Hill's 575 rushing yards in 2022, was the highest rushing yardage total by a Saint whose primary position is not running back. In fact, Hill has the five biggest single-season non-running back rushing yardage totals.

6,265 - Hill has accounted a total of 6,277 total yards in his nine-year NFL career [2,388 passing, 961 receiving, 2,439 rushing and 489 kickoff returns].

RUNNING BACKS

ALVIN KAMARA

A talented runner and receiver who was selected by the Saints in the third round of the 2017 NFL Draft out of Tennessee, Alvin Kamara enjoyed an outstanding rookie campaign. He ranked first on the club and sixth in the NFL in yards from scrimmage [1,554], second on the team in rushing and receiving, carrying 120 times for 728 yards [6.1 avg] with eight TDs and a two-point conversion, catching 81 passes for 826 yards [10.2 avg] with five touchdowns and one kickoff return for a touchdown. Kamara set a club rookie record with 14 total scores, tied for second in the NFL and finished first in the league in yards per carry. Kamara was the first Saints offensive rookie selected to the Pro Bowl since Rueben Mayes [1986], as an *Associated Press* second team All-Pro [flex], the club's first rookie All-Pro since 1993. He was also named *The Sporting News* NFL Rookie of the Year and *Associated Press* NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year.

In 123 career regular season games with 92 starts, Kamara has carried 1,643 times for 7,142 yards [4.3 avg.] with 61 touchdowns and has caught 600 passes for 4,909 yards [8.2 avg.] with 25 touchdowns. Kamara is the franchise's all-time leader in rushing yards, rushing touchdowns, total touchdowns [87], two-point conversions [7], total yards from scrimmage [12,051], all-purpose yardage [12,705] and first downs [596].

Through the first eight games of the 2025 season, Kamara has carried 100 times for 363 yards with one touchdown and caught 27 passes for 147 yards for 510 yards from scrimmage after surpassing Tiki Barber and Marcus Allen to move into fifth all-time in NFL record books for receptions by running backs on Oct. 5, vs. the New York Giants.

SCRIMMAGE LEADER

Since entering the NFL in 2017, Kamara ranks second in the league in yards from scrimmage [12,006], only one of three to have 11,000 over that period. With 1,493 scrimmage yards in 2024, Kamara is the third player since 2000 with at least 1,100 scrimmage yards in each of his first eight seasons, joining Matt Forte and Pro Football Hall of Famer LaDainian Tomlinson.



Kamara’s career scrimmage yards total is the most by an NFL player with a single team over the nine-season period.

WIDE RECEIVERS

CHRIS OLAVE

The 11th overall pick in the 2022 NFL Draft out of Ohio State, this talented wideout made an immediate impact as a rookie, catching 72 passes for 1,042 yards (14.5 avg.) and four TDs, leading the team in receptions, receiving average and receiving yards, while earning September NFL Offensive Rookie of the Month honors as the 24th player since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger to record 1,000 receiving yards as a rookie. Olave became the third Saints rookie to reach 1,000 receiving yards and the first Saints rookie since WR Danny Abramowicz (1967) to lead the team in receiving, receiving yardage and yards per catch in his first campaign. In 2023, Olave took the next step in his promising-career, leading the team in receiving and receiving yardage for the second consecutive season with 87 receptions for 1,123 yards and five TDs, tying for the team lead. He became the seventh Saint with 85 receptions in a season and the sixth with 1,100 receiving yards in a season. In 2024, prior to being placed on Injured Reserve in Week Ten (concussion), he led the team’s wide-out corps in receiving with 32 grabs for a club-best 400 yards with one touchdown in eight games. Olave has rebounded to appear in every contest, while leading the team in receiving in 2025 with 52 receptions for 503 yards with three touchdowns. Olave is ranked fourth in the NFL in receiving, tied for 13th in receiving yards and tied for seventh in third down receptions [13].

In 47 career games with 36 starts, Olave has recorded 243 receptions for 3,068 yards with 13 TDs.

BY THE NUMBERS

2 - With 72 receptions for 1,042 yards (14.5 avg.) in 2022, Olave joined wide receiver Danny Abramowicz (1967), as only the second Saints rookie to lead the team in receiving, receiving yardage and yards per catch. Also the career-high number of touchdown receptions by Olave on October 1 at Chicago.

3 - After a nine-reception, 123-yard performance on Dec. 21, 2023 at the L.A. 3,068 - With 3,068 career receiving yards from 2022-present, Olave is ranked fourth among draft picks from the Class of 2022 and 25th overall, despite placed on season-ending Injured Reserve in Week Ten of 2024.

BRANDIN COOKS

The New Orleans Saints added a speedy big-play threat to their offense, when they signed wide receiver Brandin Cooks, who started his NFL career with the club [2014-16]. Cooks, who was selected 20th overall by New Orleans in the 2014 NFL Draft, has six career 1,000-yard seasons, which is tied for the fifth-most in the NFL since he was drafted in 2014. Cooks joins Brandon Marshall as the only players in NFL history to record at least 1,000 receiving yards in a season with four different teams. Overall, he has played in 166 career games with 146 starts for New Orleans [2014-16], the New England Patriots [2017], Los Angeles Rams [2018-19], Houston Texans [2020-22] and the Dallas Cowboys [2023-24], posting career totals of 727 receptions for 9,681 yards [13.3 avg.] and 60 touchdowns, to go along with 58 rushes for 341 yards and two scores. Voted as a team captain, Cooks also provides leadership to a youthful receiver room, while making 17 receptions for 149 yards.



RASHID SHAHEED

This fourth-year wideout has made his mark for New Orleans in both the passing game and the return game, where he was selected to the Pro Bowl and voted as an AP All-Pro in 2023. In addition to the return duties in 2023, Shaheed enjoyed a breakout season on offense when he recorded 46 receptions for 719 yards [15.6 avg.] with five touchdown grabs, finishing 12th in the NFL in yards per catch. In 41 career games with 27 starts, Rashid has caught 133 passes for 1,987 yards [14.9 avg.] with 12 touchdowns, carried 19 times for 128 yards with one touchdown, brought back 63 punts for 795 yards [12.6 avg.] with two touchdowns and returned 38 kickoffs for 875 yards [23.0 avg.]. Since entering the league in 2022, Rashid's 14.9 yards per catch average ranks 16th in the league.

On Oct. 5 vs. the New York Giants, Rattler connected with Shaheed on an 87-yard touchdown, the longest play from scrimmage by the team since 2016 and tied with that play for the fifth-longest play from scrimmage in franchise history. Shaheed's 15 receptions of 40 yards or more since 2022 rank third in the NFL.

Showing significant growth in the passing game at the start of the 2024 season, Shaheed recorded 20 receptions for 349 yards [17.5 avg.] with three touchdowns, carried six times for 29 yards, brought back nine punts for 143 yards [15.9 avg.] and returned six kickoffs for 171 yards [28.5 avg.]. Shaheed’s receiving average was fifth in the NFL before suffering a season-ending knee injury in Week Six. In 2025, he has started all eight games and has 39 receptions for 431 yards with two touchdown grabs.

DEVAUGHN VELE

This second-year wideout was acquired by the Saints from the Denver Broncos near the conclusion of the preseason. A seventh round pick of Denver out of Utah in 2024, Vele appeared in 13 games with seven starts, recording 41 receptions for 475 yards with three touchdowns, tallying the most receiving yards, receptions and receiving touchdowns by a Broncos’ seventh-round draft choice as a rookie. The Saints will look to utilize the San Diego native’s 6-5, 210 frame in key spots. On Sept. 14 vs. San Francisco, Vele utilized his size to muscle in a three-yard touchdown grab.

TIGHT ENDS

JUWAN JOHNSON

The former Penn State and Oregon wideout joined the New Orleans Saints in 2020 following the NFL Draft and transitioned to tight end his second season in 2021. Overall, Johnson’s 18 touchdown grabs since 2021 lead the team. In 2024, Johnson stepped up after missing most of training camp with a foot injury to play in all 17 games with five starts and make a career-high 50 receptions for a team-best/career-best 548 yards. With 36 receptions for 368 yards with one touchdown in 2025, Johnson ranked seventh among National Football League tight ends in receptions and sixth in receiving yardage.

FOSTER MOREAU

This veteran tight end and New Orleans native who was a standout at Jesuit High School and Louisiana State University signed with the Saints in the 2023 offseason. He finished his fifth National Football League season and first with the Black and Gold after spending his first four campaigns with the Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders, who originally selected him in the fourth round of the 2019 NFL Draft. In his career, Moreau has contributed both as a pass catcher and blocker, appearing in 97 regular season games with 63 starts and has recorded 145 receptions for 1,722 yards [11.9 avg.] with 18 touchdowns, also adding seven special teams tackles. Moreau returned to action in Week Five after suffering a significant knee injury in the 2024 season finale.

DEFENSIVE LINE

DE CAMERON JORDAN

New Orleans’ first choice in the 2011 NFL Draft [24th overall] out of the University of California, Jordan has played in 234 career regular season games with 233 starts, recording 830 tackles [509 solo], a franchise record 124 sacks for a loss of 827 yards, three interceptions, 68 pass breakups, 15 forced fumbles and 12 fumble recoveries.



Jordan returned from offseason ankle surgery in 2024 to start every game and rank among the team’s leaders on the line, starting all 17 games and making 34 tackles [18 solo], including seven stops for loss, four sacks, an interception and four passes defended. Off-the-field, as a ten-time team captain, Jordan sets the standard for excellence as he was selected as the team nominee for the third time for the National Football League’s Walter Payton Man of the Year award and also has been recognized for his citizenship and commitment to family and community as the 2025 Bart Starr Award winner.

Jordan leadership and experience has served as a crucial component in a Saints season that has faced adversity with a 1-7 start. Embracing a new structure on defense, he has opened every contest and ranks among leaders on the defensive line with 20 tackles [12 solo], 2.5 sacks for a loss of 21.5 yards, one pass breakup and one fumble recovery.

On Dec. 24, 2022, at Cleveland, Jordan played in his 200th career game (regular season/postseason combined) in a Black and Gold uniform, moving him into third place on the club’s all-time games played list. The following week at Philadelphia, Jan. 1, 2023, Jordan also started his 200th career game, joining Drew Brees as only the second player to open 200 contests in franchise history. On Sept. 24, 2023, at Green Bay, Jordan played in his 206th career game, passing Thomas Morstead for second all-time in club record books. On Oct. 29, 2023, Jordan became only the second Saints player, first defensive Saint and 57th NFL defensive lineman to play in 200 regular season contests. On Nov. 5, 2023 vs. Chicago, he became only the second Saint to start 200 career regular season contests. Jordan has played in a club-best 234 career regular season games, ranked ninth all-time among defensive linemen in games played.

MOST SACKED

Jordan is now one of only 15 National Football League players to have at least 15 sacks against two opponents, 17 against the Tampa Bay Buccaneers and 23 against the Atlanta Falcons, both NFC South divisional rivals. Jordan’s 23 takedowns of former Atlanta QB Matt Ryan are the most sacks a player has had against an individual quarterback in NFL history.

Against this week’s opponent, Jordan has recorded four sacks against the Los Angeles Rams, tied for the seventh-most against an opponent. Jordan has sacked 49 different players in the regular season.

With eight Pro Bowl appearances as a Saint since joining the club in 2011, no Saints defensive player has been selected to the league’s all-star game more than Jordan in franchise history and only trails QB Drew Brees in all-time selections.

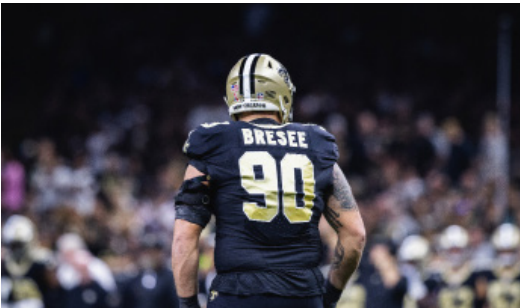

DT BRYAN BRESEE

The team’s first round selection in 2023 out of Clemson after being a three-time All-ACC selection, the Maryland native played in 26 games with 21 starts for the Tigers, producing 54 tackles (35 solo), 15 stops for loss, nine sacks, a forced fumble, an interception and five passes defended.

Bresee immediately found a role in New Orleans’ interior rotation and appeared in all 17 games, recording 24 tackles, 4.5 sacks and six pass breakups. His sack total was the highest by a Saints rookie defensive tackle since becoming an official statistic (1982) and his pass defense total was the most in club records for a rookie at the position since the statistic was first recorded (1980). He was also tied for second in the league among defensive tackles.



Bresee enjoyed a breakout sophomore campaign, playing in all 17 games and tied for fourth in the NFL among defensive tackles with a career-high and team-leading 7.5 sacks. The 7.5 takedowns are the ninth-highest total in a single-season for a Saints defensive tackle and tied for fourth in the league at the position. In 2025, Bresee has 20 tackles (seven solo), 1.5 sacks, two passes defended, one forced fumble and one blocked field goal.

In the Oct. 5 win over the Giants, DB Jordan Howden picked up a fumble forced by Bresee and returned it 86 yards for a touchdown.

DT DAVON GODCHAUX

Davon Godchaux [pronounced duh-VAHN GOD-chaw] returned to his home state to play for New Orleans in his ninth NFL campaign after being acquired from the New England Patriots. Originally a fifth round draft pick (178th overall) of the Miami Dolphins out of LSU in 2017, Godchaux has started 117-of-128 regular season games for the Dolphins (2017-20), Patriots (2021-24) and Saints (2025-), recording 450 tackles (213 solo), 5.5 sacks, 20 stops for loss, three pass breakups, three forced fumbles and one fumble recovery, as well as one solo stop in the 2021 Wild Card Playoff for New England. In 2024, he started all 17 games and posted 67 tackles (24 solo), one pass defended and one stop for loss. In 2025, he's opened every contest and recorded 21 tackles and one forced fumble.

DE CARL GRANDERSON

Signed by New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Wyoming in 2019, Granderson posted 17.5 sacks in college and possesses the prototypical frame for an NFL pass rusher. Granderson has become a significant cog in the team's defensive line rotation with 271 tackles, 33 sacks, eight pass breakups, four forced fumbles and two recoveries.

Earning the starting right defensive end position in 2023, Granderson posted a career-high 78 tackles (44 solo), led the team with a career-best 8.5 sacks for a 55-yard loss, one pass defense, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery. Starting all 17 games in 2024, Granderson had 61 tackles, 5.5 sacks, tied for second on the team with Chase Young, a career-high four passes defended, one forced fumble and a blocked extra point. Through the first seven games of the 2025 season, he has a team-leading 4.5 sacks.

DT NATHAN SHEPHERD

Originally selected by the New York Jets in the third round of the 2018 NFL Draft out of Fort Hays State, this versatile defensive tackle enters his eighth NFL season, his third campaign with the Saints. The Ajax, Ontario, Canada native has appeared in 114 career games with 48 starts, totaling 223 tackles (112 solo) and 11.5 sacks for a loss of 94.5 yards. In 2025, he has started in six-of-eight appearances and has 25 stops (ten solo) with one sack.

DE CHASE YOUNG

Originally selected by Washington with the second overall pick in the 2020 NFL Draft out of Ohio State, this talented edge rusher enters his sixth season and second in New Orleans. In five campaigns for Washington (2020-23), San Francisco (2023) and New Orleans (2024), he's has appeared in 63 games with 35 starts and recorded 139 tackles, 24 sacks, 29 stops for loss, 15 pass breakups, eight forced fumbles and four recoveries. The consensus NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year, Young recorded 7.5 sacks and made multiple splash plays with four forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries in 2020. In 2023, he played in seven games for Washington and nine for San Francisco following a mid-season trade and tied his career-best with 7.5 take-downs in helping the 49ers advance to Super Bowl LVIII. In 2025 after missing the first five games with a calf injury, Young has started/played in the last three contests, posting eight tackles (four solo), two sacks and three passes defended, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery.

Young enjoyed a breakout performance on Sunday vs. Tampa Bay, when he recorded four tackles, 1.5 sacks, including a strip sack/fumble recovery and one pass breakup, as part of a standout defensive effort where the Saints gave up only 212 total net yards.

DE CHRIS RUMPH II

Signed as a free agent in the offseason, Rumph is well-versed in defensive coordinator Brandon Staley's system. In his career, he's played in 45 games and made 46 tackles (28 solo), four sacks, two passes defended, one forced fumble, one fumble recovery and 17 special teams tackles.

LINEBACKERS
DEMARIO DAVIS

This dependable and sure-tackling defender joined the Saints in 2018 after spending his first six National Football League seasons with the New York Jets and Cleveland Browns. In his career, the Brandon, Miss. native has appeared in 218 regular season games with 204 starts for the Jets (2012-15, 2017), Browns (2016) and the Saints (2018-), recording 1,543 stops (966 solo), 44.5 sacks, four interceptions, 63 pass breakups, six forced fumbles and nine fumble recoveries.

Through the first eight games, Davis is the team leader with 72 tackles [37 solo], including four stops for loss, a team-leading two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery.

PETE WERNER
New Orleans selected this three-year starter from Ohio State in the second round of the 2021 NFL Draft. The Indianapolis native finished his college career playing in 47 career games with 35 starts, recording 185 tackles [111 solo], 16 stops for loss, four sacks, 11 pass breakups, four forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Werner helped power the Buckeyes to the College Football Playoff championship game as a senior in 2020, when he was voted by the Big Ten coaches as a first-team All-Conference selection and a Butkus Award semi-finalist, posting 54 tackles, 2.5 stops for loss, one sack and two forced fumbles.

In five seasons, Werner has played in 64 games with 56 starts and has recorded 375 tackles [237 solo], 2.5 sacks, one interception, seven pass breakups, two forced fumbles, three fumble recoveries and four special teams stops.

In 13 games started/played in 2024, Werner posted 92 tackles [54 solo] and one pass defense. In the 2025 season opener vs. Arizona, making his season debut in the team’s new alignment, Werner tied for the team lead with nine tackles, including one sack. In seven games in 2025, he has 52 stops, two sacks, two pass breakups and one fumble recovery.

SECONDARY

S JUSTIN REID

This versatile, hard-hitting, playmaking safety and South Louisiana native returned to his home state after signing with the Black and Gold during the 2025 offseason as an unrestricted free agent. Reid was originally selected by the Houston Texans in the third round (68th overall) in the 2018 NFL Draft out of Stanford. In seven NFL seasons, the former Dutchtown High School standout has played in 114 career regular season games with 110 starts for the Texans (2018-21), Kansas City Chiefs (2022-24) and Saints (2025-), recording 600 tackles (434 solo), 23 stops for a loss, 6.5 sacks, ten interceptions, with one returned 101 yards for a touchdown, 48 pass breakups, three forced fumbles, three fumble recoveries, 15 special teams stops and one blocked kick. Reid has started all 13 postseason contests he has played in and recorded 79 tackles (58 solo), four stops for a loss, 1.5 sacks and five pass breakups, playing for two Super Bowl champion squads as a member of the Chiefs. Reid has started all eight games and has 35 tackles, a split sack and two pass breakups.

CB ALONTAE TAYLOR

Selected by the Saints in the second round (49th overall) of the 2022 NFL Draft out of Tennessee, Taylor shook off early injuries to play in 13 games with nine starts and posted 45 tackles (38 solo) and a club-best 11 pass breakups, ranked fourth among NFL rookies.

Moving to the nickel position in 2023, possessing extensive experience on the inside and the outside, Taylor appeared in all 17 games with 13 starts and recorded 75 tackles, his first two career interceptions and a career-high 14 pass breakups, tied for second on the team and ninth in the NFL.

In 2024, Taylor played in all 17 games with 15 starts and ranked third on the team with a career-high 89 tackles (61 solo), was tied for fourth with four sacks and has added a club-best 16 passes defended and two forced fumbles to tie for the team best. His four sacks were tied for the most by a Saints cornerback with Alex Molden. His pass defense total was ranked fifth in the National Football League.

GET A HAND ON

Taylor’s 16 pass breakups in 2024 were tied for third in the NFC and fifth in the NFL. His 41 since coming into the league in 2022 are tied for fourth.

DB DROP

In the Sept. 8, 2024 season-opening win over Carolina, Taylor became the first Saints defensive back to record three sacks in a contest since the statistic was officially recognized by the NFL in 1982. The only other defensive back to record three sacks on kickoff weekend is former Chargers S Rodney Harrison (vs. Buffalo, 9/6/98). After splitting a sack on October 27 at the Los Angeles Chargers, Taylor’s four sacks are tied for the highest total by a cornerback in Saints record books with Alex Molden’s four in 1997, while the total ranked third among defensive backs and led all cornerbacks. Taylor’s six career takedowns are tied with Molden for the most by a Saints cornerback all-time.

TAMPA BAY BUCCANEERS VS. NEW ORLEANS SAINTS SUNDAY, OCT. 26, 2025 • CAESARS SUPERDOME SAINTS HEAD COACH KELLEN MOORE

(Opening Statement) “First division game, didn’t get it done. Unfortunate. We didn’t play enough smart, winning football, just the fundamentals of the game of football, how simple it is sometimes. I thought our defense battled, big-time goal line stop, turnover before half that they created. I thought that group did a lot of good. If you said the box score looked like this on their offense, I’d say we had a chance in this game. The team battled. Offensively, at the end of the day, we turned the ball over four times. We didn’t do enough good. We didn’t do enough good on offense to give ourselves a chance. That’s the unfortunate part of this thing. We have a lot of stuff to work through, improve and get better at. That’s the journey we get to take.”

(On making the decision to change quarterbacks) “We just need to find a way to create something on offense. It has more to do with the offense collectively. We are just not executing or playing at a high enough standard. We have to find a way to move the football consistently, protect the football and score points. This is a pure full offensive evaluation point. We’re just not there.”

(On deciding the starting quarterback for future games) “I think we just have to evaluate this whole thing for the next 48 hours on offense and find the solutions that give us the best chance to win. I thought Tyler [Shough] went in there and looked the part. He made some plays. The one interception was unfortunate. He gave us a chance to convert there. We will obviously make that evaluation quickly, and we will make some decisions moving forward. This had more to do with the whole offense just not playing well enough and hopefully trying to generate some sort of a spark there. Unfortunately, it wasn’t able to be done. “

(On the decision to pull QB Spencer Rattler) “This has so much to do with the entire offense. We’re not playing well enough. I have to coach better. I have to find the solutions. I’m not doing a good enough job, obviously. We were trying to generate a spark. Spencer, I thought, he has done plenty of good through the course of the season when you look at it from a bigger perspective. We did not move the ball well enough and created some turnovers in this game, unfortunately. We need to find a way to get the thing going. That’s our project, and that’s our efforts moving forward is to find the solutions moving forward, however it looks.”

(On the timing to make the decision to change quarterbacks) “I just felt like we were close, but we weren’t making enough, we weren’t getting it going. There was not enough on offense. I just felt like we were trying to create a spark, trying to create something that felt a little different and see if it would provide us with the urgency to execute at a higher level and play cleaner football. There were some little moments in there, some good plays, but not enough collectively.”

(On if the change at quarterback did what he was looking for) “Ultimately, we weren’t able to really get anything else going. Unfortunate how we moved the ball. There were some spurts where we moved the ball okay, and unfortunately, we weren’t able to execute over the course of the drive. This is on me. I have to find a better solution here to put ourselves in better situations to be successful. We’re just not there yet.”

(On Shough’s performance against Tampa Bay’s defense) “Todd [Bowles], Tampa, they’ve always done a great job on defense. It’s a challenge. I felt like he hung in there. Tyler hung in there; he battled. We will see how this thing progresses.”

(On mending the offensive struggles) “I have to find the solution so that we can execute at a higher level, be more consistent and protect the football. We have to be a cleaner football team, particularly on offense. That showed up a lot today. That’s on me. I have to do a great job with this. We’re not there.

We're not executing at a high enough level. I have to find the components and pieces from my standpoint that will allow us to do that."

(On Spencer Rattler's turnovers) "The ball security one was just protecting the football out in space. Guys are coming in pursuit. You have to be ready. There's always that guy coming from the backside. That was an unfortunate one. Then, the backed up one, I thought their guy made a tremendous play. Again, we have to protect the football, and that's an unfortunate sequence."

(On eight turnovers in the last two games) "Great question. Defenses sometimes create those snowball effects. Unfortunately, we are in that. The facts are the facts. We're turning the ball over too much. It is fair to view it that way. Has it happened in your career? Obviously, we have all gone through these moments. We acknowledge it and must be a cleaner, higher, efficient football team, particularly on offense. Again, we just didn't do enough winning football."

(On the navigating the quarterback room this week) "We will navigate this thing over the next 48 hours to put ourselves in a good position to have a good week and be ready to roll. I'm not into flip-flopping quarterbacks and all that sort of stuff. Just an element of lately not executing high enough football and not playing well enough on offense and trying to create a spark. I'm not into this back and forth game, but we do have to make some decisions here moving forward, really as a whole offense. There's a lot to look at with a lot of decisions"

(On if there will be competition this week at quarterback) "No, we will have to make a decision and get the reps allocated properly so someone has a chance to be successful on Sunday."

(On locker room morale) "Frustration. Guys are battling. I love this group. This group competes in every way. You always talk about the playstyle, physicality, the finish, and those components are out there. That's the tough part. We just have to play cleaner. We have to play better. We have to play to a higher standard. The frustration is there's not the consistency in all three phases where they can all complement each other. Again, our defense, there were some really good plays in there. They had a drive or two where they got some momentum going. I thought our guys battled. I think if we'd look at the box score there, I'd say we'd have a heck of a chance in this game. I thought team-wise we battled, as well. There were moments on offense, certainly. There were moments that gave us momentum at times, but we just have to find a solution that works best for us."

(On the turnovers' impact) "Turnovers obviously make a huge impact on this game. It has popped up. We have to execute at a higher level, protect the football. It's hard downs in this league. We have to find some solutions there whether it be third down, red zone and put ourselves in these challenging situations and come up with success. Again, we will do this collectively as an offense. I have to lead the way and help these guys and put them in better positions."

(On Tampa Bay's aggression defensively) "They've always done an excellent job of it. Todd's defense has always attacked the ball at a really high level. I do think when you create turnovers, when your offense has turnovers, it is the old they see it in the waters. They see there is an opportunity presented there. The defense sees it's close, and if we can keep attacking it, odds say based off evidence that's previously happened that we're going to get this football at some point. We just have to address it and kind of get ahead of this thing. It's been a couple of weeks now."

(On what he told Rattler) "I told him what I told you guys here. I am trying to create a spark here. I am trying to create something on offense. Hang in there. I love Spence. I love Tyler. I love these guys to death. These are never easy things. They're really, really challenging because I know what these guys put into this thing each and every day. We are just trying to find a formula that works to our advantage, and I will continue to address that."

(On offensive concerns) "We have to find explosive plays, absolutely. We have to put ourselves in situations to allow it. We can't be playing from behind or teams can play all this blitz and coverage game. Any play in those situations is going to be really, really hard to get anything downfield. We have to put ourselves in better situations, I think is more of the main thing. We have a shot downfield and take a sack at the plus-40 in the second drive of the game, moving the ball. Protection issues, and we don't get our shot downfield. Now all of a sudden, we were close to getting a field goal, and now we are punting. There's just too many opportunities not getting enough chances."

(On if Shough was limited today in what the team ran) "Tyler ran (it) just fine. Obviously, we were limited more from the circumstance than anything. Tyler was not limited in any way."

(On if he is satisfied with the team's buy in) "I love this group. I love the way our guys lead, the way our guys practice each and every week. They battle. I love the effort that we play with. We just have to play some cleaner football and give ourselves a chance to be more successful. There's a lot of little details in the League, and there are some really small margins in the NFL. We have to find a way to close those margins and those gaps."

(On the quarterback evaluation) "I don't know. We'll see. I think the most important thing is finding who gives us the best chance to go play in L.A. next week. We will make those decisions here shortly."

(On how Rattler received the news in-game) "He's a really special person because he handles this as well as anyone possibly can. A lot of guys in this league have to navigate these challenging situations, and he understands that. I have all the respect in the world for how he handled it, how he's operated. Again, there has been plenty of good through the course of the season. Spencer is a really good quarterback in this league. We haven't done enough good collectively as an offense to be successful. We have to continue to navigate that."

(On the penalties) "They obviously impact the game. We have to play cleaner. Too many of the pre-snap again. Those judgement penalties, and those go 50-50 all the time. Pre-snap, we have to be able to control them. It's not to our standard, and we've had plenty of games where we've met our standard, but we slipped a little bit this week."

(On the goal line defense) "Incredible performance. When you look at the last few weeks, we had a really good one against Chicago. We've had some in the past few weeks show up where our guys have done a good job battling each and every play. That's all we can ask for. Every play, there's a big time opportunity, first quarter all the way through the fourth. I thought our defense did another good job to take them all the way to fourth down to finally get it in that second drive. They're competing. They are right there."

(On shutting out Tampa Bay in the first quarter) "I thought our guys executed really well. I thought the urgency, the effort, I thought we did a really good job early in the game. It allowed us to be right in there. All the way to the second half, we were still in it. The turnovers created some opportunities for them (Tampa Bay)."

(On Baker Mayfield's comments during the week impacting the game) "I don't know. I do not know about that. The guys I thought just played really good football on defense a lot of this game and executed at a much higher level."

(On his coin toss philosophy) "We have navigated it a few different ways this year. The most important thing we are trying to get in the game and trying to take the lead. We are trying to find a way. Taking the football gives us the best opportunity to create that, and unfortunately, we did not capitalize on that this week."

DE CARL GRANDERSON

(On the goal line stand in the first half) “We just had the mindset to stop the run. We were getting after it. On the second (stand), we were just into it. We knew we could continue to keep stopping them.”

(On if this loss will sting) “We knew this game was going to be a bloodbath. We knew they were going to come with it. They tried to come out and run the ball. They only had like 87 (88) rushing yards. We were just prepared on defense. Offense had a few turnovers. We (compete) as a team. We will look at the film and (see) what we can do better.”

(On the defense being able to get pressure today) “They were like 3 for 14 (3 for 13) on third down. They weren’t really trying to throw the ball. Their mindset coming into this game was to try to run the ball after what happened to them last week against them. We knew that. We were stopping the run. After halftime, they tried to do a couple of play action to get Baker (Mayfield) going. I think that he only had 124 (net) passing yards. We had a good game plan for him.”

DE CHASE YOUNG

(On playing in a new defensive system) “Honestly, (I’m) just going out there and playing my game. I wasn’t trying to step in, fit in, or nothing. I’m just trying (to play).”

(On the goal line defense) “Fight. Between the two-yard line, you’ve just got to fight and push them back. We know they’re going to run the ball. Everybody knows they are going to run the ball. We just got to stop them. I feel like hat’s off to our interior D-line, (Davon) Godchaux, (Bryan) Bresee, Bull (John Ridgeway III), (Nathan) Shep(herd). They stood tall.”

(On the fight in this defense) “Our motto is just to control what we can control. When we get out on that field, just control all of the controllers. We’ve just got to continue to do it. Offense is going to get right. When they get right, it’s going to come together. The defense, we ain’t stopping.”

(On his fumble recovery) “It was like a blur for a second. I just went down. Somebody’s got to come get the ball out of my hands.”

(On the team having play from two quarterbacks) “You can’t control that. That’s over our head. Edge rushers, we are just locked in on what we’ve got to do. Those things, really, you just can’t worry about.”

(On getting off of the line of scrimmage quickly once the ball is snapped) “I try to jump it sometimes. Being an edge rusher and just being out there, feeling how they start to snap the ball (and) feeling the cadence, feeling the tackle, you can start feeling the motions. A lot of teams like to snap the ball right on the motion. You start timing things like that. You just get into the feel.”

(On what went right about his matchup today) “Just balling.”

(On not allowing any points in the first quarter) “We talk about every man taking care of their assignment. This week, that was real heavy, holding each other accountable and not getting our feelings (hurt) when we are not holding each other accountable, (and) just going out and executing. That is what Coach (Brandon) Staley preaches that we have to execute.”

QB SPENCER RATTLER

(On the moment and decision to change QBs) “Yeah, I mean, we came out of the half, didn't have a great drive, kept getting backed up, backed up, backed up, just really couldn't catch a rhythm, and he said, ‘Hey, we're going to go with Tyler, get a little spark, see what's going to happen, and, it's part of the game. I understand you can't control everything, but, hey, I'm going to be a great teammate and respond the right way, you know, be a pro about it, and help in any way I can.”

(On turnovers the past two weeks) “Yeah, (we were) moving the ball great the first drive, great opportunity in the rush lane, try to make a little juke move and just try to tuck it away too late and had a great punch out. So, I've got to protect the ball better when I'm running and make sure it's tight, and the backed-up one off the play-action keeper, that's unfortunate. He (Anthony Nelson) got his hand on it. Good play by him. Trying to move on after that one was tough, but I thought we were going to respond, and try to bounce back from that.”

(On the main theme of the turnover struggles) “I think last week I started pressing. I don't feel like I pressed at all this game. I got careless with keeping it high and tight on that first drive on the run. Would have had a great run there. And then the tip pick was unfortunate.”

(On putting pressure on himself after Chicago) “No, I know I wanted to play a cleaner game. (I) was not happy with the fumble, obviously, on the first drive. But try to respond in the right way. I think as a group, it starts with me. We've got to just execute better. Execute better, see things better. Credit to their defense. They did a lot of great things. Knew they were going to give us a lot of different looks, which they did. But, no, I don't feel like I put too much pressure on myself. I just have to control those moments and tuck the ball tighter, literally.”

(On not being able to convert on drives across the midfield) “Yeah, I mean, we were converting on third down well. Our numbers were okay in the first half. They brought some good pressures. We had the right answers versus a good amount of them. Could have gotten the ball maybe quicker on some checkdowns when we crossed that 50-yard line. We knew that was a high-pressure area. A couple missed stops, but got to watch the tape and see what happened when we crossed the 50 because it seems like we couldn't really get anything going once we passed that 50. So we've got to watch the tape, figure that out.”

(On what is next this week) “I just go at it the same way. It is part of the game. I have been through adversity before. I'm going to be a good teammate, have good body language, and still be a leader. So I just got to show up to work, keep a smile on my face, keep working. And you can only control what you can. I've said that before. So control what I can and keep attacking the same way.”

(On surprise at the decision to insert Shough) “A little bit, but hey, no bad feelings at all with Kellen. He's my guy. He's awesome. He's been awesome all year. And we haven't really gotten anything going on offense the last two weeks. So, hey, understood. Just got to show back up and figure out what we're going to get better at.”

(On if the decision was disappointing, but not surprising) “A little bit of both. Definitely not happy with the turnovers— you're not happy with that. Not scoring points offensively the whole game— you're not happy with that. But, hey, it is what it is. Move on. That's all you can do.”

(On his thoughts on the defense) “They played great. They gave us a chance. It's been like that the last few weeks. They played with energy. They played with more energy than us, more focus, more effort, and you can see it. So we've got to respond better, especially when they give us the opportunity before half(time) to go score at midfield. We have got to convert on that and get seven instead of three. So defense is doing their thing. Offense has got to wake up. So, we've got to figure that out and keep working at it.”

(On why the defense would be playing with more focus than the offense) “Maybe focus is not the best word. I think just playing with more fire. I think you can see that. I think offensively we can get some things going, create some momentum, create some energy. And that starts with just basic plays, right? Moving the chains, hitting the shot when it's there, getting first downs, and then ultimately finishing in the red zone, which we haven't been doing. So, we've just got to do better in those areas and keep our, really up our level in energy and fire, all that. But it comes with execution.”

(On why the fire hasn't been there on offense) “We've got to catch a rhythm. Our rhythm wasn't there. Started out the game well, turned it over. That's not great, but how you respond is everything. So, we

didn't respond well. And, you've got to execute to have that fire. We play with fire—don't get it mistaken. We play with energy. We're dialed in, but we've just got to execute better. It comes down to execution. It comes down to situations and just trusting the play that's called and getting the ramble on.”

(On if Tampa did anything that Chicago also did) “No, a little different. We knew Tampa's a heavy-pressure team. We had a good plan coming into it. I want to say the first third down of the game, they brought cover zero, blitzed everybody, and we made the right check and got the ball out. But (Todd) Bowles is going to give you something different every single play, and it's what we expected. They out-executed us, it's clear, and all game. And so we've just got to look at our preparation, take it to the next level, and move on from this one, move on to the next.”

(On how he processes the last two games with the overall improvement this season) “You want to improve each week. Last week, obviously, you got careless with the ball a little bit. But this week, first drive, again, high and tight. That is on me. I got to keep it high and tight. We preach that every day. You are never safe when you're out there running, especially as a quarterback, so you have got to keep it high and tight. I think just protecting the ball, that's it. And then taking the completions when they're there, I felt like I was taking them. A few missteps, but got to go back on the tape and watch it. But, yeah, got to be better. Got to be better.”

QB TYLER SHOUGH

(On his first time playing QB in the regular season) “Ultimately, we didn't score enough points and did not get the job done. So I was proud of how those guys battled. But ultimately, we just got to go back to the drawing board and keep getting better.”

(On stepping in with little practice as a young QB) “I felt prepared. The whole quarterback room, the offense, I think we're preparing well. I've got to continue to increase that. But for me, I was just going out there and doing everything I can and just having fun with it. But I'm going to continue to look at what we did wrong, what we did well, to try and improve on those and go from there.”

(On the conversation to switch QBs) “I was just ready to go in there and try and do my job and go out there and play. It was awesome to get in there and play. But ultimately, we're going to continue to get better and just go from there.”

(On if he knew there was a possibility of playing after halftime or if it was in the moment) “I was just in the moment, yeah. Just in the moment. Just told me to get ready to go. That was it. But, yeah, just, I mean, preparing each week and my head from every game since, you know, I was ready to go and got to continue to be ready.”

(On the nerves and emotions when told) “No nerves. Preparation-wise, body-wise, I was feeling good. So just going out there and doing everything I can. Like I said, we'll continue to kind of get in the groove, get better. It was ready to go. I just got to continue to keep building.”

(On reception from the fans cheering when he went on the field) “No, I was more focused on the play. You're not really focused on that as much. But I think my earpiece wasn't really working on the first drive as much. So I had to switch helmets immediately, which was not ideal. But we got (it) fixed.

(On his self-evaluation and what he liked/disliked about how he played) “Not yet. I mean, obviously, I've got to watch the game to completely look at everything. But at the end of the day, we didn't score enough points. So it sucks. But we will look at it, and especially myself, and see how I can get better. And then we'll continue to grow as an offensive unit to try and get the job done. Because ultimately, the defense, they played really well. They made some huge stops. They're bringing the juice. We just got to go up there and execute and protect the ball. That's really on us.”

(On his approach this coming week) “The same as I have been. I think going in each week preparation-wise, like I am going to go in, you have to continue to do that no matter what. So nothing is going to change. Just continue what I'm doing and try to have a sense of urgency this week coming into offensive meetings, preparation, and practice, because ultimately that's on us, and we've got to get better.”

(On if he's ready if it's time for him to start next week) "Oh, 100%. Yeah, I feel ready. I feel ready every single week. Obviously it's good to get there and get some reps. But, like I said before, we continue to have that sense of urgency to continue to grow and do everything we can to win."

(On what it's like having to wait for the opportunity) "Yeah, I've learned a lot. I've learned a lot because Spencer's done some really, really good things. I've been able to see that growth myself. I've been getting, most of the reps in practice from a scout team perspective. You're going against live bullets with those guys, and it's usually not the best look. Each week I've been continuing to grow, and I feel really ready to go. And, it's been good, but I've got to continue to grow. So that's got to be the answer."

(On his first completion being to another QB) "Yeah, it was a good play call. Taysom obviously was out there in the flat, but it just kind of happened that way. Yeah, it was pretty good."

(On preparing during the course of the week) "Just like I said, continual preparation. I think being a backup quarterback, you have to prepare like you're the starter because you don't know when you're going to go in. And obviously, that can be mentally and physically just a different challenge. And then when you go in there when you are playing, you lean on that preparation. So for me, it is going to be no different. And that's why you can come into games and go out there and play."

(On what is unique about developing and growing on the scout team) "For me, it's just football. You are not going against a scouted card look at what you may see. You've got cards, and you're essentially in the same plays you're running. So, how can you make it like a game? And that's kind of been the emphasis that my quarterbacks coach (Scott Tolzien), Kellen, and all the guys, how can I make this game like? And I'm trying to be really intentional toward, I mean, there is no difference. And obviously, when you're going against a really good defense like the Buccaneers, it's going to be a slight difference between that. But for me, I felt really prepared and got to continue that preparation."

(On if he finds it helpful to be able to go up against the first team defense in those situations) "100%, yeah. The pocket's real. The coverage, everything, like I said, you've got to find a way to make a play. And that's what I've kind of enjoyed throughout this moment and continue just to build that preparation and attack each day."

(On his conversation with Spencer after the switch) "It was just a dap each other up. There wasn't really a conversation. We're just trying to get going as an offense. So there wasn't too much, but Spencer's my guy. We're preparing every single week. We're going to continue to do that, and we're going to continue to all get better as an offense."

(On if the majority of his practice reps have been with Luke (Fortner) at center this season) "Yes, in the past, not this week, obviously, but yeah, in the past. So I've felt extremely comfortable going out there with him and all the guys just getting those reps in."

(On Fortner getting into the organization so far into the preseason and picking up the offense) "Yeah, he's done an excellent job. He's so smart to come in immediately, learn it like that, and contribute in multiple ways. So really proud of him and his preparation, his work, because that's not an easy task either, especially going against that front. So really proud of him and the whole line. I think they did a really good job. So we just got to continue to grow, and we'll get it done."

(On if there's an area that he's really grown in since the preseason) "Like I said before, making it game-like, because it is game-like, it's the time clock football element for sure. It's a lot different when you're on offense going against scout team B and when you're giving the defense look because they're obviously first team D. So you've got that time clock football element trying to make a game like, that's where I feel like it kind of helped me out a lot, especially when you're going against a good front. But I think for all of us and as an offense and myself, we're going to continue to prepare more and continue to do everything we can."

(On his mindset attacking the field) "My mindset is I'm going to attack no matter what, and I've got to try and do everything I can to score points and then find completions. But also, that's part of the game when you're down and you've got to go, and the clock's against you, and that's just part of it, and you're having to throw it more. You can't run the ball as much just because of the time. So, part of that, a little bit of both, but I think I've learned a lot from Spencer and the offense and around the league, watched

a lot of film, and you don't have the ability to get through four or five progressions, just because of that time clock element. So, you've got to find the best way to get out of your hand and your playmakers.”

(On if he planned to step out of some sacks or if it was instinct) “It's just instinct. You are obviously trying to play the rep as it is, and that's the battle as a quarterback is you don't want to predetermine it. So, you're just playing as it is, and it's an instinct if something happens, and if they give you a certain look, then you might change it a little bit.”

(On if anything surprised him about the speed of the game) “No, no. I think just execution-wise and all that stuff, it has got to be better, but speed of the game-wise, no, I think that is why the past few weeks, and scout team-wise, I think that has been the best thing for me to continue to learn and grow. Even preseason, I felt solid with that, and it's obviously when you get to regular season and continue forward, it's going to continue to build.”

(On opportunities to throw to the starters on offense) “In practice reps, zero, but I'm trying to do everything I can to get some after practice. Routes on there, obviously, you're getting a few but very minimal with those guys, so it was good to kind of get some reps with them. But we've given as much reps as I can after every single practice going through the whole script and throwing to Kevin (Austin Jr.) and Dante (Pettis) and all those guys, and they've done a really good job, so I'm obviously wanting to continue to grow myself., But yeah, (Chris) Olave, (Rashid) Shaheed, (Brandin) Cooks, they did a really good job just getting it out of routes, and I've got to put a couple more balls better on Juwan (Johnson) as well. He's a big difference maker, and I've got to help him out.”

(On if he needed to adjust to the speed of the receivers) “No, I think it's just football. I think there's a slight chemistry element. Each guy has different body movements or chemistry— that can continue to grow, but at the end of the day, you're just playing.”

(On if he got messages from other veteran players going in) “Yeah, Cooks came up to me and we've been talking all year and talking and he just kind of said everything that we talked about to this point, just go out there and be you. I think that's everyone, I couldn't remember, but a bunch of people came up to me and just said to be you, keep doing what you do in practice. So yeah, that was kind of the message from them, and obviously it was good to hear because I look up to those guys, love those guys, and I got to continue to be the guy for them.”

(On if he feels like it's summer again to make the decision at QB) “I don't know if that's the right comparison, but I think for me, we just got to have a better sense of urgency and as a collective offensive unit be able to go out there and execute. I think the entire defense has been playing really well, and we just got to go out there and help them out.”

(On what he wants to come from this) “I want to win. I want to help growth continue. I think we've got to go out there and execute and win, so I think to do that J (Justin) Reid said you have to go back to the little things and the little details and all that stuff, so it's been great for me to see from afar, watching just how an NFL game goes and how valuable those possessions are especially. So protecting the ball, time clock, all that stuff, finishing in the red zone, how viable that is to collect it, we've got to do it.”

(On if there have been any discussions on if his time was coming) “In the moment, yeah. I think for me, in my own head, I've been preparing the same exact way for that exact moment, so it wasn't a surprise in my head because I have to be ready, but there wasn't a preliminary conversation though.”

(On the play of Anthony Nelson) “He had two sacks. He had a touchdown. He did a great job making some plays and setting the edge for us. He had a heck of a ballgame. (On the difficulties from the one-yard line) “We thought about passing. They stuffed us pretty good up front. We have to be able to get that ball in less than eight tries. It cost us the first time. The second time we got it in. We have to have will to finish down there.”

(On the bye week coming up) “It is huge. It is halfway through the season. We need it more than anybody. Credit those guys for fighting week in and week out. People are stepping up and moving to different positions and helping us win, which you have to do in order to be a good team. We have done that in the first half. That’s going to be a hell of a second half, so we have to get ready for it.”

(On if he knows what players who will be coming back after the bye) “Not at this time. I don’t. This coming week will be key as far as seeing guys move around. When we get back to practice the week after that, hopefully we get some of those guys back.”

QB BAKER MAYFIELD

(On how proud he is of the team pushing through despite injured players) “We have a resilient group. To be at 6-2 with all of the players that we have down, guys have had to step up and get thrown into the fire. That is awesome to be able to see. A bye week is much needed for this group, but we will always take the wins, don’t get me wrong about that. Offensively, that wasn’t nearly good enough or close to what we want to look like. Defense and special teams played absolutely outstanding, and it was really fun to watch on their part.”

(On repeatedly getting stopped at the one-yard line) “Yeah, I mean we had tried the two passes prior. Some we just lean our head on, that we are going to be able to run it in when we need to. They made the plays that they needed to, and obviously we got the last one down there.”

(On the confidence he has in his defensive playmakers) “It would be nice if we matched their energy and their play, but watching that is unbelievable. That’s lights out defense. The only reason they got points was because of the turnover right before the half, and they were damn near in field goal range. They played a shutout ballgame in my eyes. Everyone was flying around making plays, and Nelly (Anthony Nelson) obviously had a hell of a game.”

(On the number of sacks he has taken in the past few weeks) “The first third down of the game, they did a good job. It was pretty good dialed up pressure in our protection plan. After that, it was just about getting the ball out on time and being able to pass off some twists and stunts. They get paid too. Some things are going to happen every once in a while, but we do need to get it cleaned up.”

(On Tez Johnson and his performance) “Yeah, Tez continues to make plays for us, flying around the field. The scramble drill aspect of it, it was lights out on that. I know he wants that one play later on in the game back, but other than that, Tez played great.”

(On his takeaways from the first eight weeks of play) “6-2, just got to be able to play one game at a time. Obviously, we have had a lot of people that have played and contributed to this team, and we are going to need everybody down the home stretch. Taking away the fact that we are leading the division right now, but it’s not even close to being over. The real football starts for us right after the bye week, and it could not have come at a better time to rest up.”

(On Anthony Nelson and his huge game) “Unbelievable game. Flying around, starting with the punch out forced fumble, then he gets a touchdown, an interception, it goes on and on. I think he probably got every single stat you would want as a defensive player, and as an outside linebacker/edge rusher. He played lights out, and I think that everybody else on defense did too, just based on how they played.”

(On the Saints being too worried about Yaya Diaby) “Yeah, I don’t know. I don’t know. We were flying around, taking the ball away. Everybody was, so fun to get started, and I think it was just good to be aggressive as a defense going out, defense going after a ball.”

(On his touchdown) “Yeah it was like I hit the ball up and uh I guess I caught it, I don’t really remember what happened. I just remembered going up and catching the ball, getting to the goal line, then in the

end zone.”

(On his first interception) “Yeah, it feels great. It feels great to get the first one, you know, like I said, it was like, I’m going to handle the ball, and it bounced up to me. So, it was awesome to capitalize on that opportunity.”

(On feeling like he was in the zone) “Yeah, you definitely get in that zone. And I think a lot of that has to do with the guys around you, like I said punch a ball. But we had a lot of guys going after the ball getting strips, punching at the catch, even some that were close that ended up being incompletions. So, when everybody is doing it, it kind of gets contagious, and you can feel it, it gives you confidence. And then, everybody joins in on it. So, it feels good to get so many.”

TE CADE OTTON

(On the offense today) “We (would) rather be saying we can do better on offense with a win than a loss, and you don’t want to be saying that too much more, but well get it right, and I think it’s probably as well timed for us to get healthy and regroup and get ready for a big win.”

(On Nelson’s interception) “So happy for him, being a guy who just works every single day, super unselfish, contributes on special teams for every single game this year. And just the way he stepped up he is the MVP of the game for us, just awesome. He was starting because of an injury. This is what championship teams do, absolutely just that mentality of next man up and having that no drama when it’s the next guy, so definitely.”

(On Baker Mayfield being vocal in the game) “Yeah it was a physical game. And you know, I think it just comes down to executing whenever you can do better. Obviously, better to know that in a win than a loss. They’re a good team, physical team, and we knew it was amazing.”

S ANTOINE WINFIELD JR

(On the defense’s takeaways this season) “Yeah, that’s our goal try to take the ball away as much as possible, give our offense more opportunities. And anytime you can make that happen, it gives us the best opportunity to win”

(On keeping the Saints out of their territory early on) “Well yeah, I mean that was our goal coming into the game, and so we just did a good job of doing it.”

(On Anthony Nelson’s game) “He’s just always in the right place at the right time when he’s playing, like he just, he just balls. And I couldn’t believe that thing. I was like, I can’t believe he just did it, shocked me, but um, he made a hell of a play on that. And he had a great game, sack, fumble, pick six, ran a quarterback over, that was nasty.”

- With the 23-3 loss against the Buccaneers, the Saints now move to 1-7 on the season.
- Up next, the Black and Gold travel to Los Angeles to play the Rams at Sofi Stadium. Kickoff is set for 3:05 p.m. CT and will be broadcast regionally on FOX (WVUE FOX 8 in the New Orleans area).
- QB **Spencer Rattler** went 15-for-21 for 136 yards and an interception. He also carried three times for 12 yards.
- QB **Tyler Shough** came in late in the third quarter and played the rest of the way. He 17-for-30 for 128 yards and an interception. He also carried three times for 12 yards.
- With his second reception of the game in the second quarter, RB **Alvin Kamara** has tallied 600 receptions for his career (two receptions for 24 yards), only one of five running backs to achieve this feat, joining Larry Centers (827), Marshall Faulk (767), LaDainian Tomlinson (624) and Keith Byars (610). He is also the first player in NFL history to record 600+ rushes and 600+ receptions for only one team in his career.
- He played in his 123rd game to move into a tie on the club's games played list for 31st with former teammate, Mark Ingram II, the two having played in the most games for Saints running backs.
- WRs **Chris Olave** and **Rashid Shaheed** led the receiving effort with eight receptions for 63 yards and nine receptions for 75 yards, respectively. Rasheed also returned one punt for eight yards for 83 all-purpose yards.
- WR **Brandin Cooks** caught three receptions for 22 yards, and surpassed the late WR Demaryius Thomas for 56th all-time in career receptions.
- QB **Taysom Hill** played in his 109th career regular season game, moving into a tie for 42nd on the club's all-time games played list with CB Fred Thomas, rushing for six yards and recording a six-yard reception.
- This was the Saints' first time all season holding an opponent scoreless in the first quarter, and the first time the New Orleans defense did not allow any offensive points (touchdown or field goal) in the first half this season.

- The Black and Gold defense held Tampa Bay to what were season-lows for an opponent in first downs (14), third down conversion rate (3-of-13-23.1 pct.), total net yards (212), net yards per play (3.8) and net yards passing (124), while also holding the Buccaneers to only 88 yards rushing on 29 carries (3.0 avg.).
- S **Justin Reid** recorded his first sack of the season and it was the second consecutive game where DE **Chase Young** tallied at least a half-sack.
- Young strip-sacked Tampa Bay QB Baker Mayfield in the second quarter, bringing his total for the game at 1.5 quarterback takedowns. It was the first game with more than one takedown for Young since vs. Washington on Dec. 15, 2024, and it was his fifth such contest of his career. His 14.5 sack yards are also his second-most in a game in his career.
- LB **Demario Davis** led the tackling effort today with 11 stops (four solo) and one forced fumble. Reid recorded all seven of his tackles (four solo) in the first half, and it surpassed his season-high. It also ranked second on the team behind Davis.
- Davis played in his 122nd game to move into a tie on the club's games played list for 32nd with current Vice President of Player Engagement and former RB/special teams ace Fred McAfee.
- CB **Kool-Aid McKinstry** finished with four tackles and a club-best two pass breakups, both occurring from pass plays inside the New Orleans one-yard line.
- DT **Nathan Shepherd** recorded his first sack of the season in the second quarter and tallied three total tackles.
- DE **Cam Jordan** played in his 234th regular season game, moving into sole possession of ninth all-time among defensive linemen in games played, surpassing Pro Football Hall of Fame DE Jason Taylor, recording one tackle.
- He also played in his 245th career game (regular + post), and tied QB Drew Brees for the most total games played in Saints history.
- K **Blake Grupe** knocked in his only field goal attempt of the day from 48 yards out.
- P **Kai Kroeger** punted three times for 121 yards with a 40.3 gross and 37.7 net, dropping two punts inside-the-20 with a long of 55 yards.
- LS **Zach Wood** played in his 140th career game and moved into sole possession of 20th in Saints history, surpassing Saints Ring of Honor member DE Will Smith.
- S **Terrell Burgess** and LBs **Isaiah Stalbird** and **Danny Stutsman** each recorded one special teams tackle apiece.

Question: Can you describe what happened after the Rashid Shaheed fumble that was initially ruled a touchdown on the field but then was called back because of the whistle?

Ronald Torbert: “We ruled that there was a fumble. It was recovered by the defense, but there was a whistle blown from the other side of the field. The official thought that the runner was down. We were able to award the defense the ball after the fumble but because the whistle had been blown, we could not award the advance afterwards.”

Question: And you said the whistle came from the far side of the field?

Ronald Torbert: “Yes.”

Question: And that was determined after a discussion amongst the crew rather than a replay review?

Ronald Torbert: “That’s correct. That was just the crew on the field that had that discussion.”

Question: And I guess just for clarity’s sake, once a whistle has been blown, the play is ruled dead automatically, correct?

Ronald Torbert: “Yes, there are certain situations, such as if there’s a fumble and an immediate recovery in the aftermath after the whistle is blown, in certain cases we can award the ball to the defense. Or award an interception. So generally, yes, the ball is dead when the whistle’s blown. But in this case we were able to award the fumble but not the advance.”
