THE MATCHUP

The New Orleans Saints (1-5) will return to the road on Sunday, when they play the Chicago Bears (2-2) at Soldier Field. New Orleans dropped a 25-19 decision to New England on Sunday and the Bears are coming off a 25-24 win at the Washington Commanders on Monday Night Football. New Orleans leads the regular season all-time series 18-13.

After taking a 16-14 lead with 1:51 remaining in the second quarter on a 38-yard field goal by K **Blake Grupe**, New England rallied with a seven-play, 73-yard drive that ended with a 29-yard touchdown pass from QB **Drake Maye** to WR **Kayshon Boutte** and the successful two-point conversion push by Maye to assume a 22-16 halftime lead.

Responding to a Patriots field goal after halftime, Grupe drilled a 54-yard kick on the third play of the fourth quarter to move back to within six. New Orleans then forced a punt and Saints QB **Spencer Rattler** completed throws to RB **Kendre Miller** and TE **Juwan Johnson**. However, Johnson's lost fumble stalled New Orleans' progress and they were unable to convert on their last drive, ending chances of a comeback.

Rattler completed 20-of-26 passes (career-high 76.9 pct.) for 227 yards with a 102.6 rating and career-best 8.73 yards per attempt and carrying four times for 20 yards. It was his second career game and second performance of the season reaching the century mark. In his first full season as the starter, Rattler has completed 139-of-203 passes (68.5 pct.) for 1,217 yards with six touchdowns, only one interception and a 91.9 passer rating, while making plays with his feet, carrying 26 times for 143 yards.

Leading the receivers was WR **Chris Olave**, who had six receptions for 98 yards (16.3 avg.), after connecting with Rattler on a 53-yard pass play on the first play from scrimmage. The fourth-year wideout is ranked seventh in the NFL in receiving with 39 receptions for 342 yards and one touchdown.

Up front on defense, the Saints allowed New England to gain only 73 yards rushing on 31 carries (2.4 avg.), with former Patriots DT **Davon Godchaux** finishing with a team-leading seven tackles (three solo) and one forced fumble.

Around the NFC South: The Carolina Panthers (3-3) play at the New York Jets (0-6), the Atlanta Falcons (3-2) play at the San Francisco 49ers (4-2) on Sunday Night Football and the Tampa Bay Buccaneers (5-1) play at Detroit (4-2) on Monday Night Football, with each division team having a road game.

THE HEAD COACHES



Named the 19th head coach in New Orleans Saints history on February 11, 2025 Kellen Moore joined the Black and Gold after serving as the offensive coordinator for the

Philadelphia Eagles in 2024. Under the guidance of Moore, quarterback Jalen Hurts and running back Saquon Barkley both had career years. Hurts finished with a career-high 103.7 passer rating, en route to Super Bowl LIX MVP honors. Barkley, who was named the 2024 National Football League Offensive Player of the Year by the *Associated Press*, had one of the best seasons on the ground in NFL history, leading the league with a franchise-record 2,005 rushing yards in the regular season. His 2,504 rushing yards including the postseason were a league record, earning Pro Bowl and All-Pro honors. The 2024 Eagles offense ranked eighth overall in net yards per game [367.2] and seventh in points per game [27.2]. Philadelphia rushed for a single-season club record 3,048 yards [sixth-best in NFL history] and finished second in the league in rushing yards per game [179.3]. Before joining the Eagles in 2024, Moore served as offensive coordinator of the Los Angeles Chargers in 2023 and the Dallas Cowboys from 2019-22 after starting his coaching career as quarterbacks coach in Dallas in 2018. In four seasons as offensive coordinator of the Cowboys, Moore's unit ranked second in the NFL in total offense [391.0 net yards per game] and scoring [27.7 points per game]. The Dallas offense was also the league's fourth-best passing offense [264.4 net yards per game] and ranked seventh in rushing offense [126.6 yards per game] over that span.

Moore played quarterback at Boise State [2007-11] before playing six seasons in the National Football League with the Detroit Lions [2012-14], Dallas Cowboys [2015-17].

Personal: Born July 5, 1988, in Prosser, Washington. He and his wife, Julie, have two daughters, Halle and Madelyn, and two sons, Kyler and Beckham. His younger brother, Kirby, is the offensive coordinator at the University of Missouri.



Ben Johnson was named head coach of the Chicago Bears on January 21, 2025. Johnson became the 18th full-time Head Coach in the franchise's 106-year history, arriving in Chicago after leading one of the NFL's most prolific offensives

with the Detroit Lions. Johnson most recently served served Offensive coordinator [2022-24] in Detroit, where his 2024 unit averaged a franchise-record 409.5 yards per game, helping the Lions average a league-high 32.4 points per game and accumulate 68 total offensive touchdowns - the most by any team in the NFL. Each of his three seasons coordinating Detroit's offense [2022-24], Detroit finished in the top-five in the league in total offense each year, including a No. 2 ranking in 2024. Over the last two seasons [2023-24], no unit averaged more points per game [30.1] or net yards per game [402.2] than Johnson's offensive unit with the Lions. Before being elevated to offensive coordinator, Johnson spent two years as the Lions tight ends coach [2020-21] following one season as an offensive quality control coach [2019]. Prior to his tenure with Detroit, Johnson served seven seasons on the staff of the Miami Dolphins, working under three different head coaches. Over his seven years in Miami, Johnson worked in the capacities of Offensive Assistant [2012], Assistant Quarterbacks Coach [2013-15], Tight Ends Coach [2015], Assistant Wide Receivers Coach [2016-17] and Wide Receivers Coach [2018].

Background: Johnson spent three years at Boston College, first as a graduate assistant [2009-10], before coaching the tight ends [2011]. A walk-on quarterback at the University of North Carolina, Johnson, who earned degrees in mathematics and computer science, spent one year as a software developer in his home state of North Carolina, before entering the coaching ranks.

Personal: Born May 11, 1986, in Charleston, S.C., Johnson and his wife, Jessica, have three children - Emory, Kennedy and Halle.

SERIES HISTORY

New Orleans leads the Saints-Bears regular season series 18-13, one of ten clubs they have a winning record against. The Saints have won one of three postseason contests, victorious in the 2020 NFC Wild Card matchup. They will also be looking to extend the regular season series win streak to eight consecutive games.

New Orleans has taken the last seven regular season meetings, including a 24-17 win on November 5, 2023 at the Caesars Superdome. The seven-game winning streak against the Bears is the longest against an opponent. Of the 31 regular season contests in the all-time series, 16 have been decided by

eight points or less. New Orleans has posted a 10-8 record in regular season contests played at the Bears.

LAST MEETING

Saints 24, Chicago Bears 17; November 5, 2023 @ Caesars Superdome - Undrafted rookie quarterback Tyson Bagent and the Chicago Bears had their way with one of the top-rated defenses in the NFL for nearly three quarters.

Then, suddenly, they couldn't cross the 50-yard line.

Bagent, who threw two of his three interceptions and lost a fumble on a sack in a nine-minute span of the fourth quarter, blamed himself for the Bears' offensive implosion in a 24-17 loss to the New Orleans Saints on Sunday.

Chicago, which lost the turnover battle 5-0, never got past its own 35-yard line in five series after tying it at 17 on Cairo Santos' 31-yard field goal with 3:27 left in the third quarter.

"It all comes to me in that last quarter being able to do a better job of taking care of the ball," Bagent said.

Two plays after the Saints went ahead 24-17, safety Marcus Maye made a diving interception of a pass Bagent said he threw late over the middle. After Chicago stopped Derek Carr on a fourth-down sneak at their 17, Bagent was picked off by cornerback Paulson Adebo.

"It was good on their part and bad on my part," Bagent said. "Tight coverage, and they made a couple of really good plays. Hats off to them, but I probably have to go somewhere else with the ball."

Chicago's defense kept giving the offense more chances, but it could not take advantage.

The Bears failed to pick up a first down after the Saints downed a punt at the two, and they turned the ball over following a missed 47-yard field goal by Blake Grupe with 2:27 left that kept them in the game.

The Saints then ran out the clock in a bizarre fourth quarter in which all 34 plays run by both teams started in Bears' territory.

WEEK 5: CB Kool-Aid McKinstry

New Orleans Saints 26, New York Giants 14 @ Caesars Superdome, Oct. 5, 2025

Finished with four tackles [three solo], along with career-highs in pass breakups [three] and interceptions [two].

SEASON GAME SUMMARIES

WEEK 1: Arizona Cardinals 20, Saints 13; September 7 @ Caesars Superdome - The New Orleans Saints fell to the Cardinals in the season opener, despite rebounding from a 20-10 third quarter deficit to come within an end zone throw of a game-tying touchdown.

Heroics on offense, defense and special teams aided the Black and Gold in a promising fourth quarter. With 4:40 left in the contest, Saints DT Bryan Bresee blocked a 46-yard field goal attempt. QB Spencer Rattler then converted a trio of first downs on throws to TE Juwan Johnson and WR Devaughn Vele and a 12-yard scramble by the signal-caller to set up a 28-yard field goal by K Blake Grupe with 2:44 left.

New Orleans then forced a three-and-out, punctuated by a third down sack of Cardinals QB Kyler Murray by CB Alontae Taylor for a 15-yard loss to get New Orleans the ball back with 1:49 left.

Rattler helped advance the Saints to the Cardinals 18-yard line to set up three tries at the end zone, the closest being a laser to Johnson that was broken up by Arizona defenders Jalen Thompson and Budda Baker.

Rattler completed 27-of-46 passes for 214 yards and carried four times for 29 yards. Johnson led the Saints in receiving with eight grabs for 76 yards. Murray completed 21-of-29 passes for 163 yards with two TDs and a 108.8 passer rating, carrying seven times for 38 yards. New Orleans RB Alvin Kamara's first half 18-yard rushing TD was the 1,000th touchdown scored at the Caesars Superdome.

New Orleans outgained Arizona through the air, 208-130, but the Cardinals held the ball for 33:46 of the contest to win the time of possession battle. The loss snapped a six-game winning streak for the Saints in openers. The Saints fell to 15-17 against the Cardinals in the all-time regular season series.

Week 2: San Francisco 49ers 26, Saints 21; Sept. 14, 2025 @ Caesars Superdome - The Saints dropped their second game of the season to the 49ers, despite bouncing back from a 26-14 early fourth quarter deficit to have a chance of winning the game in the final minutes.

An impressive drive and defensive stops paved the way for New Orleans to be back in it in the very end. After going down two scores with 12:18 left in the fourth, QB Spencer Rattler and company made some magic happen, converting a trio of first downs to WR Chris Olave and RB Alvin Kamara to set up the eventual three-yard TD to WR Devaughn Vele. The score capped off a 13 play, 71-yard drive in just six minutes flat to bring the Saints back within five. After two three-and-out drives by both teams, Rattler led a charge that just fell short. Starting on the New Orleans' six yard-line with 2:40 left, the signal-caller picked up two first downs before the 49ers defense became too much to handle.

Rattler completed 25-of-34 passes [73.5%] for 207 yards with career-highs of three passing TDs and a rating of 118.1. He also carried four times for 14 yards.

Mac Jones filled in for an injured Brock Purdy and went 26-of-39 for 279 yards and also threw three TDs with a 113.1 passer rating. New Orleans out-gained San Francisco on the ground, 121-77, but the 49ers beat the Saints in passing yardage, 344-307, and were 53% [8-for-15] on third down to New Orleans' 36% [four-for-11].

Week 3: Seattle Seahawks 44, Saints 13; Sept. 21, 2025 @ Lumen Field - New Orleans' season continued to get off to a rocky start, as they fell to the Seahawks at Lumen Field.

The Saints had gotten off to a solid start, getting the ball first and quarterback Spencer Rattler completed a pass to wide receiver Chris Olave and running back Alvin Kamara gained seven yards to put the team near midfield. However the drive stalled out and the Saints failed to convert on fourth down, giving the Seahawks the ball back. After a Seahawks first down, the Saints had stopped two run plays for one-yard gains, but on third down, DT Bryan Bresee was assessed a 12-yard unnecessary roughness penalty on a third down play that extended a drive and set up a touchdown. The Seahawks extended their lead to 21-0 by the end of the first quarter, where Seattle rookie wide receiver Tory Horton returned a punt 95 yards for a touchdown and blocked punt set up a third score.

On a drive spanning between the first and second quarter, the Saints finally got on the scoreboard with a 27-yard field goal by K Blake Grupe, but the Seahawks took advantage of a long kickoff return to set up a scoring play of a 14-yard pass from QB Sam Darnold to Horton.

The Seahawks took a halftime 38-6 lead, while the Black and Gold kept up their intensity, holding Seattle to a pair of field goals and recording a turnover, while TE Jack Stoll scored his first touchdown.

"We didn't do enough to give ourselves a chance," said Saints Coach Kellen Moore. "We need to give ourselves an opportunity to compete in these games. Too many penalties, too many missed opportunities, big special teams plays early in this game that put us behind. I appreciate our guys' battle through the second half. They didn't quit and I do appreciate that. But this is going to be a very powerful lesson for our guys on adversity and how we respond, and simply, we can't start the football game like that with the sequence that we had and put ourselves in a really poor situation."

Rattler completed 28-of-39 passes for 218 yards with one touchdown and one interception. Olave had a career-high ten catches and Stoll had his first career touchdown reception.

Week 4: Bills 30, Saints 19; Sept. 28, 2025 @ Highmark Stadium - New Orleans faced a 11-point deficit with 6:42 left in the third quarter and was able to cut it to two with 8:53 remaining in the contest, but ultimately the Saints never took the lead in the loss. New Orleans was efficient offensively, rushing for a season-high 189 yards, scoring a touchdown on their first offensive possession for the first time this season. But with Buffalo leading 14-7 in the second quarter, New Orleans was unable to capitalize or score points, when rookie S Jonas Sanker recorded his first career interception near midfield early in the second quarter. QB Spencer Rattler connected with WR Chris Olave for a three-yard TD late in the third quarter to reduce Buffalo's lead to 21-16, followed by a Blake Grupe field goal early in the fourth quarter. But the Bills answered with a four-play, 60-yard drive to gain a nine-point advantage. This was followed by a Saints drive that stalled at the Buffalo 43 on downs and the Bills then took advantage of a roughing the punter penalty to hold onto the ball and kick a field goal with 2:12 left. New Orleans fell to 0-4, while Buffalo improved to 4-0

SEASON GAME SUMMARIES

Week 5: Saints 26, New York Giants 14; October 5, 2025 @ Caesars Superdome - Spencer Rattler was so fired up by the sight of Rashid Shaheed hauling in his deep throw down the right sideline that the second-year quarterback started springing the length of the field to join the celebration.

Rattler's pivotal completion to Shaheed went for an 87-yard touchdown, DB Jordan Howden returned a fumble 86 yards for a score, and New Orleans defeated the turnover-prone Giants 26-14 for the Saints' first win under rookie coach Kellen Moore.

"Probably the fastest I ran all game," Rattler quipped when asked about chasing Rashid to the end zone. "Those plays create energy for the whole team, the whole crowd and we definitely want to have more of those."

Such moments had been rare for New Orleans since late last season, which ended with the Saints on a four-game skid before the Moore era began with four more losses to start the 2025 season.

That changed Sunday against the Giants (1-4) - also the previous team to lose to the Saints last Dec. 8. And after the game, the Saints transformed their home locker room - equipped with a sound system and color-changing LED lighting - into "Club Dub" for the first time since beating Cleveland on Nov. 17. "It's been a while since we had the fog and the music playing afterward," Howden said. "I almost forgot how that was."

The 37-year old Moore celebrated his first victory since last season's Super Bowl - a game also played in the Caesars Superdome, when he was Philadelphia's offensive coordinator.

"This is a special group," Moore said, praising Saints players' "resiliency to hang in there through some challenging times the first month."

Rattler earned his first victory in 11 career starts, passing for 225 yards without turning the ball over or taking a sack, while Shaheed finished with four catches for 114 yards for the Saints (1-4).

"It feels good to get that first win," Rattler said. "It was a team win. The defense played great. The offensive line was elite."

Giants rookie QB Jaxson Dart, who won his first career start in Week 4, passed for 202 yards and two TDs, but also turned the ball over three times, the first when the ball slipped from his hand during a scramble in the third quarter.

DE Cameron Jordan recovered as Dart, laying across Jordan's legs, disgustedly put both hands over his face.

"We had a lot of opportunities and moved the ball just fine," Dart said. "We hurt ourselves. We just kind of gave this game away."

Dart threw his first two career interceptions in the fourth quarter - both caught by Kool-Aid McKinstry for his first career picks.

New York committed five turnovers in all, none more costly than when RB Cam Skattebo was stripped by DT Bryan Bresee at the Saints 12-yard line, giving Howden the chance to scoop the loose ball on the 14 and sprint untouched the other way early in the fourth quarter.

"It was a game-changing play," Moore said.

Indeed, the Giants were threatening to score a go-ahead touchdown when Howden saw the ball on the ground behind the line of scrimmage, picked it up and recalled thinking, "Just run - run for my life." Dart completed his first five passes for 44 yards, capped by his short TD pass to TE Theo Johnson. He mixed in a 20-yard scramble with three more completions during New York's next series, which ended with Dart's 15-yard strike to Johnson for a 14-3 lead.

New Orleans closed to 14-13 on Shaheed's TD - the Saints' longest offensive play since Drew Brees connected with Brandin Cooks for a 98-yard score in 2016.

Shaheed said he tried to make S Tyler Nubin believe he was headed across the field to the left, "and once I saw his hips turn, I broke toward the [right] corner and the rest is history."

It was also Shaheed's sixth career touchdown reception of 53 or more yards, and his third covering at least 68 yards.

After Saints K Blake Grupe missed a 52-yard field goal that would have given New Orleans the lead late in the first half, the Saints got the ball back when LB Demario Davis forced receiver Darius Slayton's fumble at the Saints 35 and S Jonas Sanker recovered.

That led to Grupe's short field goal for a 16-14 Saints lead at halftime.

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SEASON GAME SUMMARIES

Week 6: New England Patriots 26, Saints 19; October 12, 2025 @ Caesars Superdome - It's not the fight, it's the finish.

It's not the play it's the precision.

It's not the drive, it's the discipline and details.

The New Orleans Saints [1-5] lost their third one-score game this season on Sunday in the Caesars Superdome, falling 25-19 to New England.

Add that to earlier losses against Arizona [20-13] and San Francisco [26-21] and the Saints have rid-dled themselves with "couldas" and "wouldas," not not filled the holes with finished business

"Tough," cornerback Alontae Taylor said. "I think it speaks volumes for us, though. Teams ain't just blowing us out like we're just trash. I think we're right there, and we've just got to find that hump and just stay consistent with that and try to get some wins under our belt."

Sunday followed a similar pattern.

Quarterback Spencer Rattler was efficient and turnover-free - 20 of 26 for 227 yards with no interceptions, but no touchdowns. New Orleans split success in its two red zone trips - a short field goal by Blake Grupe and a one-yard touchdown run by Taysom Hill - and settled for field goals when drives stalled at the New England 30-, 20- and 36-yard lines.

Grupe's last field goal, a 54-yarder with 13:41 left, pulled New Orleans to within 25-19. And the defense, which struggled while allowing the Patriots to convert six of 13 times on third down, forced punts on consecutive New England possessions.

The Saints began their final two possessions at their own 25- and 10-yard lines. The first ended after two plays when tight end Juwan Johnson caught a pass from Rattler over the middle and lost a fumble after a 14-yard gain to the 50, and the second ended after the offense gained 28 yards on five plays.

The Patriots converted one last third down on their final drive - a 21-yard pass on third-and-11 from their own 30-yard line with 2:40 left - that allowed them to run out the clock.

New England quarterback Drake Maye [18 of 26 for 261 yards and three touchdowns, with no interceptions] had completions of fourth-and-four and third-and-11 [twice] in the second half, while all three touchdown passes came on first down in the first half.

"You're guarding pretty good receivers," Taylor said, noting Maye's ability to extend plays and five receivers extra time to uncover. "They're finding ways, and Drake and them have a pretty good connection."

"So you're just going to find a guy open and throw the ball. We've just got to tightend up on our end. if we've got to cover longer, then we've got to cover longer."

Even though the Patriots didn't convert the game's lone turnover into points, they siphoned 2:45 off the clock and pinned New Orleans deep with a punt. The Saints took possession at their 10 with 5:51 left.

"It says in the Word, like, don't get tired in doing good," Johnson said. "We have a lot of stuff that we're doing that's good, so don't get tired in doing it. You're going to be rewarded when the time is right. The time isn't right, but one thing we're going to do is just keep working, clean up a few things and that's where we're at."

"Our red zone efficiency needs to be a little better, that's something we're going to clean up and be a little more efficient. I had a turnover, so obviously clean that up."

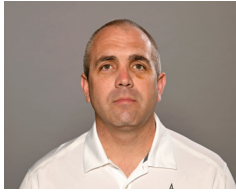
"The biggest thing is just being better and sound. It's just little things that a lot of people don't see, but we see. We'll clean up, we'll do better, we'll come out with a better attitude and a different result next week."

Several winning elements have been displayed. The Saints continue the quest to minimize - if not eliminate the costly ones.

"At the end of the day we didn't take advantage of the opportunities that were presented to us," Coach Kellen Moore said. "Every game is going to have those opportunities, and you've got to take advantage of them. They won the turnover ratio, they won some of the situational stuff and that's how this game was decided."

"I've got to find a way for myself to coach better, to put myself in better situations to be more successful as a football team. Because there's too much good and not enough in those little margins."

COORDINATOR CORNER


**SPECIAL TEAMS COORD.
PHIL GALIANO**

Phil Galiano is in his first season as the Saints' special teams coordinator and his seventh campaign in New Orleans, spending his first six years as the club's assistant special teams coach. Galiano is a veteran in the coaching ranks with 25 years of experience, including nine seasons in the NFL.

Galiano's work over the past six years with Darren Rizzi, who served as coordinator from 2019-24, helped make the kicking game an important key to victory for New Orleans. On coverage units, J.T. Gray's 93 tackles rank first in the NFL, with the special teams ace selected as an *Associated Press* All-Pro three times. The punting game has produced the top five seasons in club history for punts inside-the-20-yard line. Since 2019, the Saints have excelled in the return game. Over the six-season period, the team has been ranked fifth in the NFL in punt return average (10.4) and are tied for second in the league with three punts returned for touchdowns. The coverage units have allowed the third-lowest punt return average (7.0).

Special teams continued to be a bright spot for New Orleans in 2024, highlighted by Gray being selected as an All-Pro after recording an NFL-best 26 coverage tackles and one blocked punt. New Orleans ranked first in the NFL in opponent starting field position after kickoffs (28.2), punts inside-the-20 yard line (franchise-record 41), fifth in punt return average (12.5), seventh in opponent field goal percentage (78.6), eighth in opponent punt return average (7.6) and tenth in field goal percentage (87.1). Two blocked field goals were crucial in a pair of three-point victories. K Blake Grupe made 27-of-31 field goal attempts, six-of-eight from 50+ yards, an 87.1 percentage and scored 112 points. WR/RS Rashid Shaheed returned a punt for a touchdown for the second consecutive season.

A three-year starter at safety for Shippensburg, Galiano served as a tri-captain during his senior campaign. He helped lead the Raiders to consecutive winning seasons (1997-99). The Norristown, Pa. native graduated a degree in business administration.

COORDINATOR CORNER


**OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR
DOUG NUSSMEIER**

Doug Nussmeier is in his first season as the Saints' offensive coordinator and tenth campaign as a coach in the National Football League. A 24-year coaching veteran, Nussmeier returns to New Orleans after originally being a fourth round pick (116th overall) of the Saints in the 1994 NFL Draft out of Idaho.

Nussmeier joins the Saints after spending the 2024 season as quarterbacks coach of the Philadelphia Eagles under Saints Head Coach Kellen Moore, who served as offensive coordinator, where he proved to be a key piece of their Super Bowl LIX Champion offensive coaching staff. Jalen Hurts flourished under Nussmeier's tutelage, posting a career-high 103.7 passer rating, fifth in the league and tying for the fifth-most rushing touchdowns (14) in the league (first among quarterbacks).

Nussmeier rejoined the NFL with the Dallas Cowboys in 2018, after previously spending two seasons with the St. Louis Rams from 2006-07 as quarterbacks coach. After serving on the Cowboys staff from 2018-22, he served as quarterbacks coach of the Los Angeles Chargers in 2023. In between, he spent 13 seasons coaching at the collegiate level, where he tutored eight different players who were selected in the first or second round of the NFL Draft.

Nussmeier finished his career at the University of Idaho as the program's all-time leading passer with 10,824 career passing yards over five years (1989-93). He won the Walter Payton Award in 1993, which was at the time given annually to the top player in NCAA Division 1-AA after throwing for a program-record 33 touchdown passes and leading the Vandals to a national semifinal berth. Nussmeier was named Big Sky Conference Offensive Player of the Year in 1992 and was inducted into the University of Idaho Athletic Hall of Fame in 2008.

A Portland, Ore. native, Nussmeier and his wife, Christi, have two sons, Garrett and Colton, and a daughter, Ashlynn. Garrett is in his fifth season as a quarterback at LSU.

COORDINATOR CORNER


**DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR
BRANDON STALEY**

Brandon Staley is in his first season as the Saints' defensive coordinator. Staley is a 19-year coaching veteran with three as head coach of the Los Angeles Chargers.

This will be Staley's second stint as a defensive coordinator after leading the Los Angeles Rams to finish first in the NFL in total defense in 2020.

Staley arrived in New Orleans after serving most recently as assistant coach/defense of the San Francisco 49ers in 2024. Working with multiple position groups, as well as aiding 49ers Head Coach Kyle Shanahan, the San Francisco defense finished the season ranked eighth in the NFL in opponent net yards per game (317.4) and fifth against the pass (192.8 ypg.). DL Nick Bosa was selected to the Pro Bowl after recording nine sacks, one interception, one forced fumble and one recovery. ILB Fred Warner was selected to the Pro Bowl, Associated Press All-Pro and PFWA All-NFL, as he registered 131 tackles (76 solo), two interceptions returned for 70 yards, including a 45-yard touchdown return and four forced fumbles. Saints CB Issac Yiadom led the team with a career-high three takeaways.

During his tenure as Chargers head coach, Staley led Los Angeles to a 24-24 record and guided the franchise to its first postseason appearance since the 2018 season. In his final season with the Chargers (2023), Staley helped QB Justin Herbert continue one of the best starts to a career in NFL history as no quarterback has more completions or passing yards over the first four seasons of a career than Herbert. Staley also saw WR Keenan Allen and LB Khalil Mack put together career seasons and earn themselves nods to the Pro Bowl Games roster. Before becoming an NFL coach, Staley spent 11 seasons coaching at the collegiate level. In 2016, Staley earned National Coordinator of the Year honors for Division III.

A native of Perry, Ohio, Staley played collegiately as a quarterback at the University of Dayton for four seasons (2001-04) before finishing at Division II Mercyhurst College in 2005. He and his wife Amy, have three sons, Colin, Will and Grant.

ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH


**ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH/
RUNNING BACKS
JOEL THOMAS**

Joel Thomas, a 25-year coaching veteran, returns to New Orleans to tutor the clubs running backs in 2025. He previously spent nine years with the Black and Gold (2015-23). After spending the 2024 season coaching the New York Giants running backs, the Port Angeles, Wash. native returns to New Orleans with a additional title of associate head coach.

During Thomas' initial nine-year tenure in tutoring the Saints running backs, the Black and Gold tied for second in the NFL with 161 rushing touchdowns and his backs registered 25 individual 100-yard performances. Under his tutelage, Alvin Kamara, the Saints' all-time rushing yardage leader, earned five consecutive Pro Bowl selections (2017-21) and was the only NFL player with at least 1,160 total yards from scrimmage in each of the seven seasons he first coached him, three of them 1,500 or more.

In 2023 under Thomas, Kamara became the franchise's all-time leader in yards from scrimmage, rushing touchdowns and total touchdowns. Thomas also coached Mark Ingram II, New Orleans' all-time rushing leader from 2021-24 (6,500 yards), for six years, including two 1,000-yard campaigns. During Thomas' first New Orleans tenure, the Saints ranked in the top six in the NFL in rushing three times (2017, 2018 and 2020).

With the Giants in 2024, Thomas oversaw the development of rookie tailback Tyrone Tracy Jr., a fifth round pick. Tracy earned PFWA All-Rookie when he carried 192 times for 839 yards (4.4 avg.) with five TDs to rank second among NFL rookies for the season and New York rookies all-time in rushing yards. He added 38 receptions for 284 yards with one TD to tally 1,123 yards from scrimmage, the fifth-highest total among NFL rookies in 2024 and fourth among Giants rookies all-time.

Thomas lettered as a running back at Idaho from 1993-98 and still holds Vandals career records with 3,929 rushing yards and 51 touchdowns. He was inducted into the University of Idaho Athletic Hall of Fame in 2008. Thomas earned his degree in communications in 1998.

Thomas and his wife, Ebbie, have two boys, Teyo and Niko.

Numerous Saints players, coaches and administrators are not the only members of their families to make a name for themselves in pro football. 22 Saints players, coaches or front office staff have relatives who have played, coached or served in the front office in the NFL.

Tight Ends Coach Chase Haslett - Father, Jim Haslett, played linebacker for the Buffalo Bills from 1979-85 and finished his playing career with the New York Jets in 1986. Haslett was an assistant for the Los Angeles Raiders, Saints, Pittsburgh Steelers, St. Louis Rams, Washington Redskins, Cincinnati Bengals and Tennessee Titans and was head coach of the Saints from 2000-05, where he guided the franchise to their first playoff victory in 2000 and was named NFL Coach of the Year.

Defensive Pass Game Coordinator Terry Joseph - Cousin Vance Joseph is currently defensive coordinator of the Denver Broncos, was their head coach from 2017-18 and has also been an assistant coach with six other teams, after also playing for the New York Jets and Indianapolis Colts. Younger cousin, Sammy, played for the San Francisco 49ers in 2007.

Senior VP/Asst. GM-College Personnel Jeff Ireland - Stepson of Chiefs Hall of Fame linebacker/center E.J. Holub. Grandson of Eagles running back and Bears personnel executive Jim Parmer.

National Scout Terry Wooden - Brother, JoJo, has been a longtime scout in the NFL Player Personnel ranks.

Run Game Coordinator T.J. Paganetti - Brother, Ryan, has coached with the Philadelphia Eagles and Jacksonville Jaguars. He is currently the Head Coach Research Specialist of the Las Vegas Raiders.

Edges Coach Jay Rodgers - Brother, Jeff, is a longtime NFL assistant who is currently assistant head coach/special teams coordinator for the Arizona Cardinals.

Linebackers Coach Peter Sirmon - Son, Jackson, currently plays for the New York Jets.

Assistant Wide Receivers Coach Kyle Valero - Father, Art, was an NFL assistant for ten years.

Linebacker Demario Davis - Cousin of the late Steve McNair, the standout quarterback for the Tennessee Titans [1995-2005] and Baltimore Ravens [2006-07].

ROSTER ROLL CALL

On the Saints active roster as of September 22, 30 were on the active roster, a reserve list of the practice squad at the end of the 2024 season. Among newcomers, the roster includes six unrestricted free agents, one waiver acquisition, four veteran free agents, four trade acquisitions, six draft picks and two rookie free agents.

Of the players, 43 have less than four years of previous NFL experience, including 12 rookies. The following is a breakdown of New Orleans' roster by years of experience (year entering): 15 years - 1, 14 years - 1, 12 years - 1, 10 years - 1, 9 years - 5, 8 years - 5, 7 years - 6, 6 years - 3, 5 years - 10, 4 years - 6, 3 years - 9, 2 years - 10, 1 year - 6, rookies - 12.

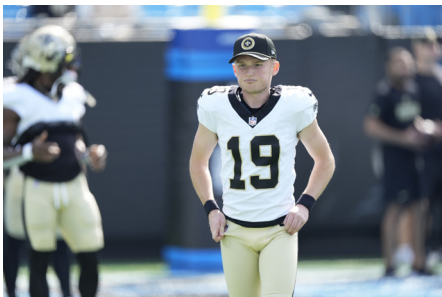

BUCKING THE ODDS

The Saints have a long tradition of finding players as free agents signed after the draft that make an impact immediately or after developing their careers initially on the practice squad. Several undrafted Saints on the roster have played key roles on offense, defense and special teams.

Over the past 22 years, the Saints [2018-22: DB **J.T. Gray**, WR/RS **Deonte Harty** and WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed**] and San Diego/Los Angeles Chargers [2003: G **Kris Dielman**, TE **Antonio Gates** and WR **Kasim Osgood**] are the only two teams to have three players signed as undrafted free agents be selected to a Pro Bowl for the team that originally signed them.



Joining New Orleans following the 2023 NFL Draft after a graduate transfer season at Notre Dame and playing the first four years of his college career at Arkansas State, K **Blake Grupe** won a pre-season competition to handle placekicking duties and in three seasons, has drilled 71-of-87 field goal attempts [81.6 pct.], including 27-of-31 kicks [87.1 pct.] in 2024 with a career-long of 57 yards in the season-opening win over Carolina. Grupe drilled two 50+ yard kicks through the uprights in two contests in 2024. In the past three contests, Grupe has made 50+-yard kicks in successive weeks.

DE **Carl Granderson** joined the club in 2019 as an undrafted free agent out of Wyoming and has appeared in 94 games with 46 starts, posting 267 tackles [158 solo], 33 sacks for a loss of 202.5 yards, eight pass breakups, four forced fumbles and two recoveries, one blocked field goal and one blocked extra point. In 2025, Granderson has been hot from the start, starting all six games and recording 27 tackles [19 solo], 4.5 sacks and two pass breakups. Through the first six contests, Granderson is tied for sixth in the NFC in sacks. In the first two games, he recorded more than one sack.

An integral part of the offense and return game, through the first six games in 2024 before suffering a season-ending knee injury vs. Tampa Bay, Oct. 13, Shaheed had 20 receptions for 349 yards [17.5 avg.] with touchdowns of 43-, 59- and 70 yards, carried six times for 29 yards, returned nine punts for a league-best 143 yards [NFL-high 15.9 avg.] and six kickoffs for 171 yards [28.5 avg.]. Rasheed’s 15.9 punt return average ranked first in the NFL and his 692 all-purpose yards fourth. Overall, since coming into the league in 2022, his 15 catches of 40 yards or more rank third in the NFL.

With his second career punt return on a 54-yard runback on Oct. 13, 2024 vs. Tampa Bay, Shaheed joins Reggie Bush [4] and Tyrone Hughes [2] as only the third Saint with multiple punt returns for touchdowns.

In 2025, a healthy Shaheed has provided a spark both on offense and in the return game. In the first six contests, he has recorded 26 receptions for 316 yards [12.2 avg.] with two touchdowns and in the return game, he has brought back 8 punts for 112 yards [14.0 avg.], including a 40-yard runback. He is fifth in the NFL in punt return average.

TE **Juwan Johnson** first led Saints tight ends with four touchdown receptions in 2021, converting to the position that offseason after playing wideout in college and as a rookie in 2020, he signed as an undrafted free agent from Oregon. Johnson led Saints tight ends with a career-high 50 receptions for a club-best 548 yards in 2024, adding three touchdown grabs. He has led the Saints with 15 receiving touchdowns over the past four seasons, tied for sixth over that period among NFL tight ends. In his career, Johnson has played in 73 games (40 starts), making 172 receptions for 1,859 yards with 19 TDs.

In 2025, Johnson is tied for sixth among tight ends in receiving with 26 grabs for 236 yards with one TD. His 168 receptions as a tight end (four additional were as a WR in 2020) are fourth among the position all-time for the club.

Signing with New Orleans following the 2025 NFL Draft, G **Torricelli Simpkins III** started all 48 games along the offensive lines at North Carolina Central [2021-23] and South Carolina [2024]. After playing the first three seasons of his career at NCCU, where he was a third-team All-American in 2023, he transferred to South Carolina in 2024. He opened all 13 games at right guard for the resurgent Gamecocks and received third-team All-SEC honors. He competed on all three interior positions in 2025 training camp and secured a roster spot based on his play in preseason games following injuries to the offensive line. After contributing on special teams in the first two contests, Simpkins received his first career start at left guard at Seattle on Sept. 21, saw extensive action at right guard on Sept. 28 at Buffalo and started at right guard in the Oct. 5 victory over the New York Giants, where the offensive line did not give up a sack.

Signing with New Orleans following the 2024 NFL Draft, LB **Isaiah Stalbird** played at Nebraska [2019] and South Dakota State [2020-23]. He played in 64 games and made 251 tackles, 18.5 for loss, three sacks, an interception, 19 pass breakups, five forced fumbles, two recoveries and three blocked punts for the 2022 and 2023 FCS National Champions. Stalbird finished with three coverage stops in five games. Through six games in 2025, Stallbird has a team-high eight coverage stops.

WR **Mason Tipton** stuck on the 53-man roster in 2024 after showing bright spots in the preseason following a college career at Yale, where he posted 132 receptions for 1,067 yards with 19 touchdowns. In 2024, he had 14 receptions for 99 yards. In the 2025 preseason, Tipton led the team in all receiving categories with eight receptions for 158 yards [19.8 avg.] with one touchdown, ranking fifth in the league in receiving yardage. On Sunday against New England, he returned four kickoffs for 89 yards., both career-highs

DRAFT HISTORY

The New Orleans Saints 2025 draft class, the first under first-year Head Coach Kellen Moore features six-of-nine players currently contributing to the team's 53-man roster, three offensive players, as well as three defenders, with three [T Kelvin Banks Jr., S Jonas Sanker and CB Quincy Riley] starting on Sunday against the New York Giants. On offense, Executive VP/General Manager Mickey Loomis split the selections among four different positions. Defensively, New Orleans added players at four different positions as the unit makes the switch to Defensive Coordinator Brandon Staley's 3-4 scheme, a safety, a linebacker and a cornerback currently contributing.

FROM THE FIELD TO THE SIDELINE

Kellen Moore is the seventh New Orleans Saints head coach to have played in the National Football League, joining Tom Fears, John North, Dick Nolan, Mike Ditka, Jim Haslett and Sean Payton. Moore, who finished his college playing career at Boise State with a record of 50-3, the most wins by a quarterback in NCAA history, played six seasons for the Detroit Lions (2012-14) and Dallas Cowboys (2015-17).



BARKING UP THE RIGHT TREE

With Moore as his offensive coordinator in 2024 with the Eagles, Philadelphia running back Saquon Barkley had one of the best seasons by a tailback in NFL history. The consensus National Football League Offensive Player of the Year, a first-team Associated Press All-Pro and Pro Bowl starter selection, Barkley led the league with a franchise-record 2,005 rushing yards in the regular season, making him just the ninth player in NFL history to post 2,000+ rushing yards in a season, eight-most in league records. Including 499 rushing yards in the playoffs which ranked third all-time, Barkley’s 2,504 rushing yards were the most in NFL single-season history (regular season and postseason combined).

NOTHING HURTS

In 2024 in Philadelphia, under the tutelage of Moore who served as offensive coordinator and Saints Offensive Coordinator Doug Nussmeier, who was quarterbacks coach, Eagles signal-caller Jalen Hurts was able to put together one of the best seasons of his career. The Super Bowl Most Valuable Player ranked among the top eight in the league in yards per attempt (fourth, 8.0), passer rating (fifth, career-high 103.7), completion percentage (eight, career-high 6.7 pct.) and total touchdowns (32, eighth). In Super Bowl LIX, Hurts completed 17-of-22 passes (77.3 pct.) for 221 yards, two touchdowns, a 119.7 passer rating and 72 rushing yards with one touchdown on the ground, the most rushing yards by a signal-caller ever in a Super Bowl.

FIVE STRAIGHT

In the Oct. 26-14 win over the New York Giants, the Saints recorded takeaways off five consecutive Giants possessions. This was the first time this occurred in an NFL game since the Kansas City Chiefs intercepted Jets QB Ryan Fitzpatrick on the last five Jets possessions of the contest in a 24-3 Chiefs win on Sept. 25, 2016. It was the first time the Saints had defensive takeaways on five consecutive possessions, since they had five straight interceptions in a 27-3 win at the Phoenix Cardinals on Dec. 22, 1991. DRAFT CONTRIBUTORS

The team's top three selections in the 2024 NFL Draft started multiple games for the Saints in 2024. Below is a summary of the performance of five of the top six 2024 draft picks, as each of them of them look to make a jump in 2025:



RT Taliese Fuaga, Oregon State [D1] - Selected with the 14th overall pick out of Oregon State, the Saints were able to address an immediate need, while also acquiring a building block for the future. Fuaga was an anchor on the Saints offensive line in his rookie campaign, seamlessly moving over to the left tackle position for his first NFL season, where he opened every game for an offense that improved in every rushing metric. Starting all 17 games, he was the first Saint to start every game in his rookie year at the offensive line's most challenging position since J.T. Taylor in 1978. Now in 2025, Fuaga has moved back to his natural right tackle position. After missing the Week Three contest at Seattle, he returned to the lineup in Week Four and helped spur a run game that gained a season-high 189 yards. On December 5, against the New York Giants, he anchored an offensive line that kept QB Spencer Rattler's jersey clean and did not give up a sack.



CB Kool-Aid McKinstry, Alabama [D2] - Selected in the second round of the 2024 NFL Draft with the 41st overall pick out of Alabama, McKinstry arrived in New Orleans having covered many of the nation's top wideouts in the Southeastern Conference for the last three years.

In 2023, the consensus first-team All-American was a semifinalist for the Jim Thorpe Award, making 32 tackles and seven passes defended. In New Orleans, McKinstry played in 15 games with nine starts, moving into the starting lineup in Week Eight and recorded 44 tackles with seven pass breakups, often tasked with covering an opponent's top wide-out. Through the first six contests/starts of 2025, he has recorded 20 tackles [17 solo] with, two interceptions and four pass breakups, recording the first two picks of his career in the October 5 win over the New York Giants, capturing NFC Defensive Player of the Week honors for the first time in his career. In 21 career games with 15 starts, he has career totals of 65 stops [52 solo], two picks, 11 pass breakups and one special teams tackle.



QB Spencer Rattler, South Carolina [D5a] - Selected with the team's first selection in the fifth round [150th overall] out of South Carolina, Rattler completed 900-of-1,313 passes [68.5 pct.] for 10,807 yards with 77 touchdowns, and only 32 interceptions for the Gamecocks [2022-23] and Oklahoma [2019-21].

As a rookie, Rattler played in seven games with six starts, he completed 130-of-228 passes for a Saints rookie-record 1,317 yards with four touchdowns, also carrying 18 times for 146 yards.

After opening the most games by a Saints rookie signal-caller since Archie Manning in 1971, Rattler captured the starting position in a preseason competition. In the 2025 season opener vs. Arizona on Sept. 7, Rattler completed 27 passes for 214 yards, while carrying four times for 29 yards, while leading his team to the Cardinals 18-yard line for three pass attempts to potentially tie a 20-13 Cardinals lead.

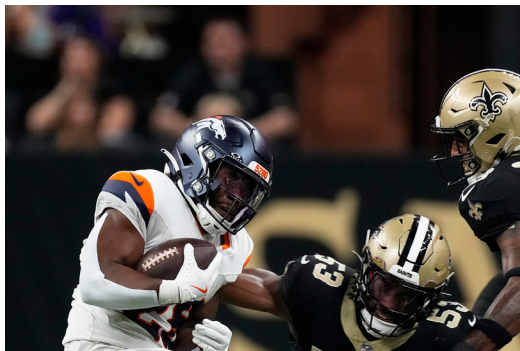
SAINTS AT BEARS

Rattler took another big step forward on Sept. 14, vs. San Francisco, when he completed 25-of-34 passes [73.5 pct.] for 207 yards with three touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 118.1 passer rating. Rattler also carried four times for 14 yards, including a nine-yard scramble on third-and-nine. He set career-bests for completion percentage, touchdown passes and passer rating.

Rattler led the Black and Gold to his first victory as a starter on October 5 vs. the New York Giants, when he completed 21-of-31 passes [67.7 pct.] for 225 yards with a career-long 87-yard touchdown pass to WR Rashid Shaheed, tied for the fifth-longest play from scrimmage in franchise history and a 99.5 passer rating.

On Sunday, October 12, vs. New England, Rattler completed 20-of-26 passes [career-high 76.9 pct.] for 227 yards with a career-high 8.73 yards per attempt and a 102.6 passer rating. Rattler also carried four times for 20 yards.

On the season, Rattler has completed 138-of-204 passes [68.0 pct.] for 1,217 yards with six touchdowns, only one interception and a 91.9 passer rating. Rattler has also utilized his feet, carrying 26 times for 143 yards [5.5 avg.].



LB Jaylan Ford, Texas [D5c] - The last of three fifth round draft picks by the club in 2024, Ford was selected out of Texas, where during he posted 287 tackles, 27.5 stops for loss, three sacks, ten pass breakups, six interceptions, four forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries. As a rookie, Ford established a role on special teams, contributing five tackles before suffering a fibula injury in Week 17. Ford is expected to comprise a role as a core special teams player in 2025, making three stops, including tying a career-high with two on Sunday vs. New England and contributing in all six contests.



DT Khristian Boyd, Northern Iowa [D6] - A sixth round selection, Boyd appeared in 49 career games in college and collected 149 tackles [59 solo], 22.5 stops for loss, 10.5 sacks, five pass breakups and two forced fumbles.

In his final college season, Boyd started all 11 games along the defensive line and had 43 stops [17 solo], 6.5 tackles for loss, 3.5 sacks and a pass breakup, while earning All-Missouri Valley Football Conference first-team and consensus FCS third-team All-American. Following a full offseason, and utilizing his 6-2, 320-pound frame to fit into the Saints' 3-4 alignment under Staley, the Kansas City native led the Black and Gold with two sacks in the preseason, while providing a push up the team's interior defensive line. Boyd made his 2025 regular season debut in Week Four at Buffalo and finished with one tackle.

LINING THEM UP



One of Head Coach Kellen Moore's first tasks was shoring up the alignment and the overall depth of the Saints offensive line- a unit that saw nine different starting combinations during the 2024 campaign. The line has gelled recently, giving up only two sacks of quarterback Spencer Rattler in the last two weeks.



A franchise that has consistently invested in the offensive line with four first round picks in the last six seasons, the past two campaigns have been no different. On the interior center **Erik McCoy** and right guard **Cesar Ruiz** have combined to play in 162 career regular season games with 156 starts. Additionally McCoy, a two-time Pro Bowler and Ruiz, have started five postseason contests between them. Ruiz successfully rehabilitated from an ankle injury suffered on Sept 28 at Buffalo, only missing one contest.

In three of the last four seasons, New Orleans has continued to fortify their offensive line, selecting left tackle **Kelvin Banks Jr.**, right tackle **Taliese Fuaga** and left guard **Trevor Penning** with first round selections.



Banks, 6-5, 315, was selected with the ninth overall pick out of Texas this past April, the highest selection by the Black and Gold since 2005. A three-year starter who opened all 42 games he played in at left tackle for the Longhorns from 2022-24, Banks was the 2024 Outland Trophy winner and a unanimous All-American selection. In his final season, Banks has lined up and the left tackle position that he manned flawlessly as a college standout for the last three seasons, facing weekly challenges from some of the NFL's elite pass rushers, a leading candidate for league All-Rookie honors.

2024 first round pick Fuaga, immediately moved into left tackle as a rookie after being a two-year starter at right tackle at Oregon State, earning first-team All-American in 2023. In 2025, the Tacoma, Wash. native became the first Saints rookie to start every game at the position since J.T. Taylor in 1978. In 2025 for his second-team campaign, Fuaga has moved back to the right tackle position he manned in Corvallis.



2022 first round pick Penning opened all 17 games at right tackle in 2024 in his third pro season after playing left tackle his first two. Spending time at both tackle positions and right guard at Northern Iowa from 2018-21, he will utilize his toughness and physicality by slotting into left guard in 2025. He returned to action in Week Four after missing the first three contests with a toe injury.

Building up depth was also a priority of the club this offseason. **Dillon Radunz**, who was signed as an unrestricted free agent from Tennessee, has opened 31 contests at every position but center, opening the first two contests in Penning's absence at left guard. **Torricelli Simpkins III** earned a roster spot as an undrafted free agent out of South Carolina with his ability to play both guard and center, starting games at left guard and right guard this season.

SPECIAL TEAMS OVERVIEW

Saints special teams will benefit from the elevation of Phil Galiano to coordinator, after serving as assistant special teams coach for the past five-and-a-half seasons before taking over coordination of the unit midway through the 2024 season. During Galiano's tenure, the special teams units have consistently ranked among the NFL's leaders in placekicking, coverage and return units, producing Pro Bowlers and AP All-Pros, also setting various club records in placekicking, punting, return game and coverage units.



PUNT RETURN GAME

Shaheed provided a spark to the punt return game prior to his season-ending knee injury in Week Six. He was on his way to being selected as a Pro Bowl starter as a return specialist and a first-team Associated Press All-Pro as a punt returner again. Shaheed is only the third Saint with multiple punt returns for touchdowns.

As a team, in 2024 New Orleans finished fifth in the NFL in team punt return average, one of five clubs to have a runback for a touchdown. TYLER SHOUGH

With their eyes on competition and development, the New Orleans Saints selected Tyler Shough (last name pronounced Shuck) out of Louisville with the team’s selection in the second round (40th overall) of the 2025 NFL Draft. In seven seasons at Oregon [2018-20], Texas Tech [2021-23] and Louisville [2024], Shough played in 42 games and completed 599-of-951 passes [63.0 pct.] for 7,820 yards with 59 touchdowns, also carrying 246 times for 733 yards with 11 scores.

TAYSOM HILL



Hill has brought unheralded versatility to the Saints offense and special teams. He’s played in 107 games with 50 starts at several positions. He has carried 444 times for 2,437 yards, the most by a Saint not to play running back full-time, with 34 touchdowns, ranked fifth in club records. In the passing game, he has caught 99 passes for 943 yards with 11 touchdowns, completed 194-of-303 passes for 2,388 yards with 11 touchdowns, returned 20 kicks for 489 yards, made a defensive tackle, a forced fumble, 15 special teams tackles and blocked one punt. Hill showed his versatility in 2024, starting all eight contests he has played in, carrying 39 times for 278 yards with six touchdowns to tie for the team lead, catching 23 passes for 187 yards and completing two passes for 21 yards. Hill also contributed on several special teams units, forcing a safety on an aborted punt and returning a kickoff for 42 yards. After suffering a season-ending knee injury in Week 13, Hill aggressively rehabbed to return to action in Week Four. On Sunday, vs. the New England Patriots, Hill scored his first rushing touchdown of the season on a one-yard run.

BY THE NUMBERS

1 - With 2,437 rushing yards, 2,388 passing yards and 943 receiving yards, Hill is the only NFL player in the Super Bowl era with 2,000 career passing yards, 2,000 career rushing yards and 900 career receiving yards.

2 - With his standout performance in the the November 17, 2024 35-14 win over Cleveland, Hill picked up his second NFC Offensive Player of the Week honors.

3 - Hill has picked up three conference player of the Week awards, including an NFC Special Teams Player of the Week honor in 2018 at Tampa Bay, when he blocked a punt, joining RB/RS Reggie Bush as only the second Saint to capture conference player of the Week honors in two phases.

5 - In 2023 and 2024, Hill saw action at five offensive positions [quarterback, fullback, tailback, tight end and wide receiver], as well as participating on special teams.

RUNNING BACKS

ALVIN KAMARA

A talented runner and receiver who was selected by the Saints in the third round of the 2017 NFL Draft out of Tennessee, Alvin Kamara enjoyed an outstanding rookie campaign. He ranked first on the club and sixth in the NFL in yards from scrimmage [1,554], second on the team in rushing and receiving, carrying 120 times for 728 yards [6.1 avg] with eight TDs and a two-point conversion, catching 81 passes for 826 yards [10.2 avg] with five touchdowns and one kickoff return for a touchdown. Kamara set a club rookie record with 14 total scores, tied for second in the NFL and finished first in the league in yards per carry. Kamara was the first Saints offensive rookie selected to the Pro Bowl since Rueben Mayes [1986], as an *Associated Press* second team All-Pro [flex], the club's first rookie All-Pro since 1993. He was also named *The Sporting News* NFL Rookie of the Year and *Associated Press* NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year.

In 121 career regular season games with 90 starts, Kamara has carried 1,626 times for 7,093 yards [4.4 avg.] with 61 touchdowns and has caught 595 passes for 4,884 yards [8.2 avg.] with 25 touchdowns. Kamara is the franchise's all-time leader in rushing yards, rushing touchdowns, total touchdowns [87], two-point conversions [7], total yards from scrimmage [11,977], all-purpose yardage [12,631] and first downs [593].

Through the first six games of the 2025 season, Kamara has carried 83 times for 314 yards with one touchdown and caught 22 passes for 122 yards for 436 yards from scrimmage after surpassing Tiki Barber and Marcus Allen to move into fifth all-time in NFL record books for receptions by running backs on Oct. 5, vs. the New York Giants.

SCRIMMAGE LEADER

Since entering the NFL in 2017, Kamara ranks second in the league in yards from scrimmage [11,977], only one of three to have 11,000 over that period. With 1,493 scrimmage yards in 2024, Kamara is the third player since 2000 with at least 1,100 scrimmage yards in each of his first eight seasons, joining Matt Forte and Pro Football Hall of Famer LaDainian Tomlinson.

KENDRE MILLER

A third round draft pick of the Saints in 2023, Miller was a three-year standout at TCU, posting 2,410 rushing yards and 26 touchdowns in only 33 games with 17 starts. In 2022, the first-team All-Big 12 selection carried 242 times for 1,399 yards and 17 touchdowns.

In three seasons, Miller has played in 20 games with two starts and has carried 126 times for 490 yards [4.0 avg.] with three touchdowns, caught 20 passes for 180 yards and returned 15 kickoffs for 370 yards, including a 43-yarder on Sept. 7, vs. Arizona, the longest by a Saint since 2020.

Miller had his most productive performance of the season in Week Four at Buffalo, when he carried 11 times for 65 yards [5.9 avg.] with an 18-yard touchdown run, tying his career-high for a carry.

WIDE RECEIVERS

CHRIS OLAVE

The 11th overall pick in the 2022 NFL Draft out of Ohio State, this talented wideout made an immediate impact as a rookie, catching 72 passes for 1,042 yards [14.5 avg.] and four TDs, leading the team in receptions, receiving average and receiving yards, while earning September NFL Offensive Rookie of the Month honors as the 24th player since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger to record 1,000 receiving yards as a rookie. Olave became the third Saints rookie to reach 1,000 receiving yards and the first Saints rookie since WR Danny Abramowicz [1967] to lead the team in receiving, receiving yardage and yards per catch in his first campaign.

In 2023, Olave took the next step in his promising-career, leading the team in receiving and receiving yardage for the second consecutive season with 87 receptions for 1,123 yards and five TDs, tying for the team lead. He became the seventh Saint with 85 receptions in a season and the sixth with 1,100 receiving yards in a season.

In 2024, prior to being placed on Injured Reserve in Week 10 [concussion], he led the team’s wide-out corps in receiving with 32 grabs for a club-best 400 yards with one touchdown in eight games. Olave has rebounded to appear in every contest, while leading the team in receiving in 2025 with 39 receptions for 342 yards with one touchdown. Olave is seventh in the NFL in receiving and tied for fifth in third down receptions [11].

In 45 career games with 34 starts, Olave has recorded 230 receptions for 2,907 yards with 11 TDs.

BRANDIN COOKS

The New Orleans Saints added a speedy big-play threat to their offense, when they signed wide receiver Brandin Cooks, who started his NFL career with the club (2014-16). Cooks, who was selected 20th overall by New Orleans in the 2014 NFL Draft, has six career 1,000-yard seasons, which is tied for the fifth-most in the NFL since he was drafted in 2014. Cooks joins Brandon Marshall as the only players in NFL history to record at least 1,000 receiving yards in a season with four different teams. Overall, he has played in 164 career games with 145 starts for New Orleans (2014-16), the New England Patriots (2017), Los Angeles Rams (2018-19), Houston Texans (2020-22) and the Dallas Cowboys (2023-24), posting career totals of 723 receptions for 9,656 yards (13.4 avg.) and 60 touchdowns, to go along with 58 rushes for 341 yards and two scores. Voted as a team captain, Cooks also provides leadership to a youthful receiver room, while making 13 receptions for 124 yards.



RASHID SHAHEED

This fourth-year wideout has made his mark for New Orleans in both the passing game and the return game, where he was selected to the Pro Bowl and voted as an AP All-Pro in 2023. In addition to the return duties in 2023, Shaheed enjoyed a breakout season on offense when he recorded 46 receptions for 719 yards (15.6 avg.) with five touchdown grabs, finishing 12th in the NFL in yards per catch in 38 career games with 24 starts, Rashid has caught 116 passes for 1,844 yards (15.9 avg.) with 12 touchdowns, carried 19 times for 128 yards with one touchdown, brought back 60 punts for 766 yards (12.8 avg.) with two touchdowns and returned 38 kickoffs for 875 yards (23.0 avg.).

Since entering the league in 2022, Rashid’s 15.6 yards per catch average ranks eighth in the league.

Showing significant growth in the passing game at the start of the 2024 season, Shaheed recorded 20 receptions for 349 yards [17.5 avg.] with three touchdowns, carried six times for 29 yards, brought back nine punts for 143 yards [15.9 avg.] and returned six kickoffs for 171 yards [28.5 avg.]. Shaheed’s receiving average was fifth in the NFL before suffering a season-ending knee injury in Week Six. In 2025, he has started all six games and has 26 receptions for 316 yards with a club-best two touchdown grabs.

DEVAUGHN VELE

This second-year wideout was acquired by the Saints from the Denver Broncos near the conclusion of the preseason. A seventh round pick of Denver out of Utah in 2024, Vele appeared in 13 games with seven starts, recording 41 receptions for 475 yards with three touchdowns, tallying the most receiving yards, receptions and receiving touchdowns by a Broncos’ seventh-round draft choice as a rookie. The Saints will look to utilize the San Diego native’s 6-5, 210 frame in key spots. On Sept. 14 vs. San Francisco, Vele utilized his size to muscle in a three-yard touchdown grab.

TIGHT ENDS

JUWAN JOHNSON

The former Penn State and Oregon wideout joined the New Orleans Saints in 2020 following the NFL Draft and transitioned to tight end his second season in 2021. Overall, Johnson’s 18 touchdown grabs since 2021 lead the team. In 2024, Johnson stepped up after missing most of training camp with a foot injury to play in all 17 games with five starts and make a career-high 50 receptions for a team-best/career-best 548 yards. With 26 receptions in 2025, Johnson is tied for sixth among NFL tight ends.

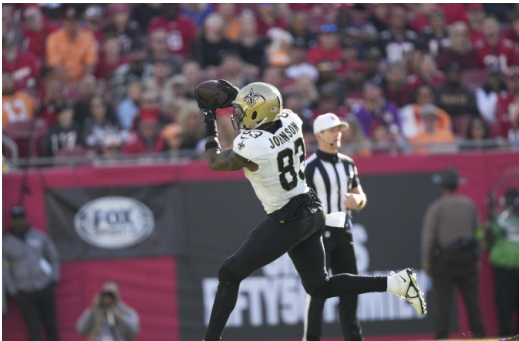

FOSTER MOREAU

This veteran tight end and New Orleans native who was a standout at Jesuit High School and Louisiana State University signed with the Saints in the 2023 offseason. He finished his fifth National Football League season and first with the Black and Gold after spending his first four campaigns with the Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders, who origianlly select-ed him in the fourth round of the 2019 NFL Draft. In his career, Moreau has contributed both as a pass catcher and blocker, appearing in 95 regular sea-son games with 63 starts and has recorded 145 receptions for 1,722 yards (11.9 avg.) with 18 touch-downs, also adding seven special teams tackles. Moreau returned to action in Week Four after suf-fering a significant knee injury in the 2024 season finale.

DEFENSIVE LINE

DE CAMERON JORDAN

New Orleans’ first choice in the 2011 NFL Draft (24th overall) out of the University of California, Jor-dan has played in 232 career regular season games with 231 starts, recording 826 tackles (509 solo), a franchise record 124 sacks for a loss of 827 yards, three interceptions, 68 pass breakups, 15 forced fumbles and 12 fumble recoveries.



Jordan returned from offseason ankle surgery in 2024 to start every game and rank among the team’s leaders on the defensive line, starting all 17 games and making 34 tackles (18 solo), includ-ing seven stops for loss, four sacks for a loss of 26 yards, one interception and four passes defended. Off-the-field, as a ten-time team captain, Jordan sets the standard for excellence as he was select-ed as the team nominee for the third time for the National Football League’s Walter Payton Man of the Year award and also has been recognized for his citizenship and commitment to family and com-munity as the 2025 Bart Starr Award winner. Jor-dan leadership and experience served as a crucial component in a Saints season that faced adversi-ty in the form of extensive injuries and an in-sea-son coaching change in the face of a seven-game losing streak. His leadership helped set a tone for the team to rally and win three contests after a 2-7 start to the 2024 season.

On Dec. 24, 2022, at Cleveland, Jordan played in his 200th career game (regular season/postseason combined) in a Black and Gold uniform, moving him into third place on the club’s all-time games played list. The following week at Philadelphia, Jan. 1, 2023, Jordan also started his 200th career game, joining Drew Brees as only the second player to open 200 contests in franchise history. On Sept. 24, 2023, at Green Bay, Jordan played in his 206th career game, passing Thomas Morstead for second all-time in club record books. On Oct. 29, 2023, Jordan became only the second Saints player, first defensive Saint and 57th NFL defensive lineman to play in 200 regular season contests. On Nov. 5, 2023 vs. Chicago, he became only the second Saint to start 200 career regular season contests. Jordan has played in a club-best 232 career regular season games, tied for tenth all-time among defensive linemen in games played with Hall of Fame defensive ends Chris Doleman and Reggie White.

MOST SACKED

Jordan is now one of only 15 National Football League players to have at least 15 sacks against two opponents, 17 against the Tampa Bay Buccaneers and 23 against the Atlanta Falcons, both NFC South divisional rivals. Jordan’s 23 takedowns of former Atlanta QB Matt Ryan are the most sacks a player has had against an individual quarterback in NFL history.

Against this week’s opponent, Jordan has recorded 4.5 sacks against the Chicago Bears. Jordan has sacked 49 different players in the regular season, looking to make Bears signal-caller Caleb Williams the 50th player he’s dropped.

With eight Pro Bowl appearances as a Saint since joining the club in 2011, no Saints defensive player has been selected to the league’s all-star game more than Jordan in franchise history and only trails QB Drew Brees in all-time selections.

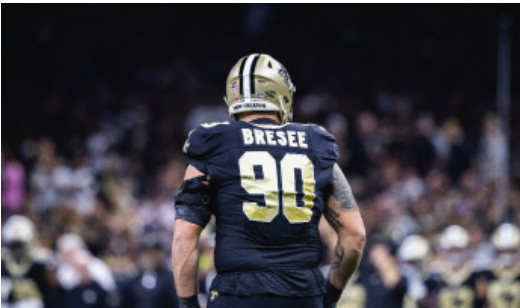

DT BRYAN BRESEE

The team’s first round selection in 2023 out of Clemson after being a three-time All-ACC selection, the Maryland native played in 26 games with 21 starts for the Tigers, producing 54 tackles (35 solo), 15 stops for loss, nine sacks, a forced fumble, an interception and five passes defended.

Bresee immediately found a role in New Orleans’ interior rotation and appeared in all 17 games, recording 24 tackles, 4.5 sacks and six pass breakups. His sack total was the highest by a Saints rookie defensive tackle since becoming an official statistic (1982) and his pass defense total was the most in club records for a rookie at the position since the statistic was first recorded (1980). He was also tied for second in the league among defensive tackles.



Bresee enjoyed a breakout sophomore campaign, playing in all 17 games and tied for fourth in the NFL among defensive tackles with a career-high and team-leading 7.5 sacks. The 7.5 takedowns are the ninth-highest total in a single-season for a Saints defensive tackle and tied for fourth in the league at the position. In 2025, Bresee has 15 tackles (five solo), one sack, one pass defense, one forced fumble and one blocked field goal.

In the Oct. 5 win over the Giants, DB Jordan Howden picked up a fumble forced by Bresee and returned it 86 yards for a touchdown.

DT DAVON GODCHAUX

Davon Godchaux [pronounced duh-VAHN GOD-chaw] returned to his home state to play for New Orleans in his ninth NFL campaign after being acquired from the New England Patriots. Originally a fifth round draft pick (178th overall) of the Miami Dolphins out of LSU in 2017, Godchaux has started 115-of-126 regular season games for the Dolphins (2017-20), Patriots (2021-24) and Saints (2025-), recording 441 tackles (210 solo), 5.5 sacks, 20 stops for loss, three pass breakups, three forced fumbles and one fumble recovery, as well as one solo stop in the 2021 Wild Card Playoff for New England. In 2024, he started all 17 games and posted 67 tackles (24 solo), one pass defended and one stop for loss. Against his former team Sunday, he had a season-high seven stops and one forced fumble.

DE CARL GRANDERSON

Signed by New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Wyoming in 2019, Granderson posted 17.5 sacks in college and possesses the prototypical frame for an NFL pass rusher. Granderson has become a significant cog in the team's defensive line rotation with 267 tackles, 33 sacks, eight pass breakups, four forced fumbles and two recoveries.

Earning the starting right defensive end position in 2023, Granderson posted a career-high 78 tackles (44 solo), led the team with a career-best 8.5 sacks for a 55-yard loss, one pass defense, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery. Starting all 17 games in 2024, Granderson had 61 tackles, 5.5 sacks, tied for second on the team with Chase Young, a career-high four passes defended, one forced fumble and a blocked extra point. Through the first six games of the 2025 season, he has 4.5 sacks, tied for seventh in the NFC.

DT NATHAN SHEPHERD

Originally selected by the New York Jets in the third round of the 2018 NFL Draft out of Fort Hays State, this versatile defensive tackle enters his eighth NFL season, his third campaign with the Saints. The Ajax, Ontario, Canada native has appeared in 112 career games with 48 starts, totaling 218 tackles (110 solo) and 10.5 sacks for a loss of 86.5 yards. In 2025, he has started all six games and has 20 stops (eight solo).

DE CHASE YOUNG

Originally selected by Washington with the second overall pick in the 2020 NFL Draft out of Ohio State, this talented edge rusher enters his sixth season and second in New Orleans. In five campaigns for Washington (2020-23), San Francisco (2023) and New Orleans (2024), he's appeared in 61 games with 33 starts and recorded 132 tackles, 22 sacks, 28 stops for loss, 12 pass breakups, seven forced fumbles and three recoveries. The consensus NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year, Young recorded 7.5 sacks and made multiple splash plays with four forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries in 2020. In 2023, he played in seven games for Washington and nine for San Francisco following a midseason trade and tied his career-best with 7.5 takedowns in helping the 49ers advance to Super Bowl LVIII. Young fit in with the New Orleans defensive line with 31 tackles, 5.5 sacks, a takedown on a two-point conversion attempt, a forced fumble and three pass defenses.

DT KHRISTIAN BOYD

Originally selected by the Saints in the sixth round of the 2024 NFL Draft out of Northern Iowa, this widebody run-stuffer can control the point of attack. After playing six games as a rookie, Boyd is pushing for more playing time, recording three tackles and one sack in the preseason.

DE CHRIS RUMPH II

Signed as a free agent in the offseason, Rumph is well-versed in defensive coordinator Brandon Staley's system. In his career, he's played in 43 games and made 40 tackles (24 solo), four sacks, two passes defended, one forced fumble, one fumble recovery and 17 special teams tackles.

LINEBACKERS

DEMARIO DAVIS

This dependable and sure-tackling defender joined the Saints in 2018 after spending his first six NFL seasons with the New York Jets and Cleveland Browns. In his career, the Brandon, Miss. native has appeared in 216 regular season games with 202 starts for the Jets (2012-15, 2017), Browns (2016) and the Saints (2018-), recording 1,522 stops (956 solo), 44.5 sacks, four interceptions, 63 pass breakups, five forced fumbles and nine fumble recoveries.

PETE WERNER

New Orleans selected this three-year starter from Ohio State in the second round of the 2021 NFL Draft. The Indianapolis native finished his college career playing in 47 career games with 35 starts, recording 185 tackles [111 solo], 16 stops for loss, four sacks, 11 pass breakups, four forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Werner helped power the Buckeyes to the College Football Playoff championship game as a senior in 2020, when he was voted by the Big Ten coaches as a first-team All-Conference selection and a Butkus Award semi-finalist, posting 54 tackles, 2.5 stops for loss, one sack and two forced fumbles.

In five seasons, Werner has played in 62 games with 54 starts and has recorded 369 tackles [236 solo], 2.5 sacks, one interception, seven pass breakups, two forced fumbles, three fumble recoveries and four special teams stops.

In 13 games started/played in 2024, Werner posted 92 tackles [54 solo] and one pass defense. In the 2025 season opener vs. Arizona, making his season debut in the team’s new alignment, Werner tied for the team lead with nine tackles, including one sack. In five games, he has 46 stops, two sacks, two pass breakups and one fumble recovery.

SECONDARY

S JUSTIN REID

This versatile, hard-hitting, playmaking safety and South Louisiana native returned to his home state after signing with the Black and Gold during the 2025 offseason as an unrestricted free agent. Reid was originally selected by the Houston Texans in the third round (68th overall) in the 2018 NFL Draft out of Stanford. In seven NFL seasons, the former Dutchtown High School standout has played in 112 career regular season games with 108 starts for the Texans (2018-21), Kansas City Chiefs (2022-24) and Saints (2025-), recording 587 tackles (426 solo), 23 stops for a loss, six sacks, ten interceptions, with one returned 101 yards for a touchdown, 47 pass breakups, three forced fumbles, three fumble recoveries, 15 special teams stops and one blocked kick. Reid has started all 13 postseason contests he has played in and recorded 79 tackles (58 solo), four stops for a loss, 1.5 sacks and five pass breakups, playing for two Super Bowl champion squads as a member of the Chiefs. Reid will look to help fortify the back end of the Saints defense in 2025.

CB ALONTAE TAYLOR

Selected by the Saints in the second round (49th overall) of the 2022 NFL Draft out of Tennessee, Taylor shook off early injuries to play in 13 games with nine starts and posted 45 tackles (38 solo) and a club-best 11 pass breakups, ranked fourth among NFL rookies.

Moving to the nickel position in 2023, possessing extensive experience on the inside and the outside, Taylor appeared in all 17 games with 13 starts and recorded 75 tackles, his first two career interceptions and a career-high 14 pass breakups, tied for second on the team and ninth in the NFL.

In 2024, Taylor played in all 17 games with 15 starts and ranked third on the team with a career-high 89 tackles (61 solo), was tied for fourth with four sacks and has added a club-best 16 passes defended and two forced fumbles to tie for the team best. His four sacks were tied for the most by a Saints cornerback with Alex Molden. His pass defense total was ranked fifth in the National Football League. In the 2025 season opener, he had two tackles and a sack.

GET A HAND ON

Taylor’s 16 pass breakups in 2024 were tied for third in the NFC and fifth in the NFL. His 41 since coming into the league in 2022 are tied for fourth.

DB DROP

In the Sept. 8, 2024 season-opening win over Carolina, Taylor became the first Saints defensive back to record three sacks in a contest since the statistic was officially recognized by the NFL in 1982. The only other defensive back to record three sacks on kickoff weekend is former Chargers S Rodney Harrison (vs. Buffalo, 9/6/98). After splitting a sack on October 27 at the Los Angeles Chargers, Taylor’s four sacks are tied for the highest total by a cornerback in Saints record books with Alex Molden’s four in 1997, while the total ranked third among defensive backs and led all cornerbacks. Taylor’s six career takedowns are tied with Molden for the most by a Saints cornerback all-time.

Opening comments

“Great battle of a football game. New England made more plays than we did. I thought our playstyle, I thought our guys played fast, played physical. At the end of the day, we didn’t take advantage of opportunities that were presented to us. Every game is going to have those opportunities, and we have to take advantage of them. They won the turnover ratio. They won some situational stuff, and that’s how this game was decided. We didn’t make enough plays. I have to find a way for myself to coach better and put ourselves in better situations to be more successful as a football team. There’s too much good and not enough in those little margins. Medically, I think we are OK. Nothing really drastic coming out of the game. We just have to get better and keep moving.”

(On the roadblocks offensively)

“That’s on me. We’re not doing a good enough job. We’re extending some drives. We’re not getting the ultimate points that we need out of that drive. Whether it be settling for a field goal from the red zone or getting stalled out across the 50-yard line, we are not doing enough good stuff. It seems like there are always a bunch of little things that come up between penalties, missed opportunities. We have to find a way to get that because I thought we moved it at a decent rate. We just did not take advantage of the opportunities.”

(On defending against New England’s wide receivers)

“New England made plays. They had one-on-one opportunities, and they made plays. Those were contested, those were challenging situations, but we have to find a way to come up with more of those on our end. That’s what this game is all about. It’s one-on-one opportunities throughout this game, and we have to find a way to get it done.”

(On the defense’s slow start)

“We’re not starting fast enough from a defensive perspective. We have to play better. We have to have a sense of urgency out there and be ready to roll. That’s a couple of weeks in a row in that scenario, and that’s not the formula we want to be feeling, like we are playing behind for a little while. Again, we have to take advantage of opportunities. They come in all four quarters, and every moment is the same value from the first quarter on to the fourth quarter.”

(On the margins of victory being so slim)

“That’s what this game is. It’s the NFL. The margins are really, really small, really tight. They have good players; we have good players. It’s a matter of taking advantage of the opportunities that are presented. We’re not getting it done. We are not getting it done in those situations when we have opportunities. For myself, I have to figure out a way to get us there. We’re close, knocking on the door, but we’re not opening it. I have to find a way to get better.”

(On WR Chris Olave’s drops)

“Obviously, we’ll look at the film to evaluate all the details of it, but we had some opportunities in the passing game. We didn’t get it done. Those are challenging plays. I get it. We just have to find a way collectively as a group to come up with more success.”

(On QB Spencer Rattler’s performance)

“I thought Spencer had some good football out there. He used his legs again. He had some completions to put ourselves in some situations. We finished a couple of drives in the red zone. We had some third-down [opportunities] that we did not get. He had one turnover-worthy play in the middle. Fortunately for us, it wasn’t a turnover. We all have to keep getting better because, obviously, we haven’t met the standard yet. We are not there yet as a group. Specifically, your question as an offense, we have to get better. We have to put our head down and go.”

(On the last possession at the end of the first half)

Obviously, if we could get some positives out there, we had three timeouts. We could play that thing through a four or five-play sequence. We got sacked. We were behind the chains there, so we just let it bleed out.”

(On facing New England QB Drake Maye)

“He did some really good things. I thought he extended plays. He used his feet in a timely manner. He sits in there. I thought he played well, and we were not able to get to him. We were not able to get to him and create some sacks and rush opportunities on him. We were not able to impact him enough in the pocket.”

(On miscommunication in the secondary)

“We will look at the film. Obviously, there will be some great opportunities to grow from. They were able to make some explosive plays in the passing game.”

(On LB Danny Stutsman coming into the game)

“We just put him in there to get him going. He obviously is a good player. He’s done some good football. I think it’s important that he has some exposure to the league. As far as putting him in there, he’s played some good football.”

(On LB Isaiah Stalbird)

“He’s obviously one of those guys that’s kind of had a package in various games in the last two weeks. He’s a good player. He’s earned those opportunities.”

(On Stutsman coming in for LB Demario Davis)

"I think it's just trying to find a series that works best for us. Somewhere in the middle of the game, we anticipated trying to create that opportunity. I think it was good for him to get out there."

(On where the team needs to improve to secure wins)

"We just have to win in the margins, which is all the situational football. We have to convert in the red zone, convert third downs. Those are hard downs. Those are tough downs. We have to do a better job in those situations."

(On the New England passing game)

"They made the plays. They made the plays in those contested situations. Their receivers were physical and were attacking the football, and they made the plays when they had to."

(On determining when to capitalize on those margins)

"Potentially. We have to calculate it in every possible way. We have to understand there are numbers we certainly are very cautious of. Then, there's the element of making sure we got what we need to have an opportunity to compete. I look into every little margin and see if I have to do better from being more aggressive or calling some fourth downs."

(On the mood in the locker room)

"Just frustration. There are opportunities. I think everyone can feel that. We had our opportunities in this game, and we just didn't get it done."

(On K Blake Grupe's performance)

"Blake kicked the ball really well. He gave us an opportunity, and he was able to execute in the field goal game. I thought there were some positives there."

(On Taysom Hill's touchdown)

"Awesome for Taysom. He's a phenomenal player. Down in that red zone, he's a really valuable piece."

(On the explanation he received on the fumble)

"You guys can ask Replay Assist or New York for all of that stuff, whatever their media deal is. We just were told there was some movement on the ball, and that's all I get."

(On what impressed him with Drake Maye's performance)

"He kept battling. Not all of it was perfect today, but I give them a lot of credit. They competed and they answered. We extended plays and made huge plays down the field and had some glimpses of good football. We'll have to clean up a lot of things, but it's great to go on the road and get a win."

(On his understanding of the offensive pass interference call)

"I don't really have much explanation. They see something, and we'll continue to play aggressive. We'll have to clean some of the penalties up, those live ball fouls that we talked about. In that situation, we want to be really aggressive and we're taking a shot, long yardage. And, we had a great punt from Bryce (Baringer) after that. So, we'll remain aggressive, and our players will be competitive. That was what they felt like they saw."

(On his thoughts on how Kayshon Boutte played)

"I think he factored and certainly came up huge in the end. I think he's gotten better, and I like his demeanor as well. Never too up, and never too down. Sometimes the ball finds him, and he makes plays, and when it doesn't, he understands that it just wasn't his snap. To be there at the end, take a good hit, and score? He came up with a huge play there and went in there and won the game for us on a third down. You see the confidence that Drake (Maye) has with him, his play strength, and his ability to go frame the football in a big situation. I hope he can enjoy this for a few minutes with his family, and anybody else that came out here. That was a big play for him."

(On the call challenges and replay reviews)

"I don't think you ever really know nowadays. John Streicher does a fantastic job trying to figure out how they're going to see it. Sometimes they see it the way that we do, and sometimes they don't. We just try to be as smart as we possibly can, and we felt like those were plays that could help us."

(On why the running game didn't pick up momentum)

"Probably one guy away, like always. But we had some positive runs, and we'll keep practicing it and working on it."

(On his confidence in Drake Maye when the game was on the line)

“You know, being in protection and operation, and him knowing where he wants to go with it, and that timing and putting it in a spot where KB (Kayshon Boutte) could make a play.”

(On this being a teachable win for his young team)

“Better than an old team getting out of here with a loss I would say. We will never not enjoy and embrace winning in this league. But I do think that the guys are very aware of the fact that it can be better, and that it will have to be better the more that we go along here and play. I think that is a good sign that they know there are some plays that we left out, and that we could have played better. To do that on the road, and to be able to end it with the ball offensively and in victory formation is fun.”

(On the mindset that the ball will find his offensive players)

“We’ve talked about it; some days it’s well this guy only played this or he didn’t have any snaps. There’s a lot of things that go into offense that a lot of us don’t see or aren’t going to show up, like some of the dirty work, the clear out routes, or guys finishing third level to help guys gain some extra yards. I think it’s just a testament to these guys that understand that they have an opportunity and are going to make the most of it. We need as many of those guys as we can possibly get, in all three phases.”

(On the importance of Marcus Jones on defense)

“He’s one of our captains, and he’s a team leader. I’m very comfortable with him back there. He’s challenged, given that most of the time those matchups are a bigger player. Him being able to go up there, contest the catches, and get some PBUs. Also being able to hammer a ball out, whether that was Christian (Gonzalez) or (Charles) Woods there at the end. That was another one that was probably close to being challenged. Looking at that where the distance we were going to gain getting the ball back, they did us a favor there with that punt. That was probably another close one. Disappointed in getting three points on the goal line. Those are the types of things that will have to improve. We’ll have to make sure that we are not beating ourselves down there, and that we score when we do that and get the ball on the one-yard line.”

(On potentially missing a named game captain)

“Yeah, he didn’t go out. Khyiris Tonga was nervous to go out there maybe, I’m not sure. You can only take six out there, and I’m not sure. I don’t know how many guys are going to go, I usually just talk to Hunter (Henry) and one or two guys that I know are going to go out there. But yeah, it was Khyiris. He does a lot of the dirty work for us on defense, and I really enjoy being around him since the time we signed him.”



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NEW ORLEANS SAINTS

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TE JUWAN JOHNSON

(On the loss and needing to move forward after today towards Chicago)

"We have another game ahead of us. We (need to) take full advantage of the opportunity that we have before us. We go against the Bears. We have a great opportunity to bounce back. That is really all that you can do. You can't harp on what it is or whatever the situation is. It's like, this is what we've (been) dealt, you deal with it and you keep moving forward and make plays."

(On his fumble today)

"It is what it is. I thought that I had it, but I didn't. The refs officiated and said it's a fumble, so it's a fumble. The only thing that I can do is go into this week and focus on holding the ball properly. I feel like I should've went in holding it a little tighter going in with two hands and we wouldn't be having this conversation right now, but that's what it is. If there is something that I need to improve on and something that I need to work on, that is my intention for this week, carrying the ball like this organization depends on it, because it does, and go forward."

DE CHASE YOUNG

(On a close loss today)

"Yeah, we would love to get those. We've just got to finish. That is something that we always talk about. In games like this, we've just got to execute."

(On how he feels physically after today's game)

"I feel great. I feel good."

(On the keys to New England converting on several third downs)

"We've just got to execute. Everybody do your job (and) when the play comes your way, you've just got to make sure that you make it. They made more plays than we did."

K BLAKE GRUPE

(On making field goals today)

“Just have to go out there every time you take the field and execute your job. There’s been a lot of guys in this locker room, coaches, and everybody that is part of this (team) that will say it is only one game. We have to do it every week. Whether it is backing me, having faith in me, and helping to build me up throughout the week, I am thankful that when it’s time to go out there and prove to the people that support me.”

S JUSTIN REID

(On the Patriots' 1st TD to DeMario Douglas)

“Just a barrier in communication. Things that we can just get better at and things that we will have to get better at.”

(On the frustration of close losses)

“Yeah, we do not live in a league that we get moral victories for being close. That is not what the NFL is. The NFL is not about points; it is about W's and L's. We only have one W so far, so it is a bit frustrating. Every man in the building knows what it takes to win. We just have to go out there and execute better. I see myself as a leader. I won't let this start breaking the team down, though. We are not going to allow this to turn into something where we're going to start pointing fingers at each other. And I know that the internet and everything are going to want to tear us apart. But the most important thing is that the team stays as a team on the inside of the building. And that's what I'm going to continue to push. Because as long as we stay together, we'll always have a chance. And if we eliminate the mistakes, we have a chance against anybody, seriously. But we don't stand a chance if we're shooting ourselves in the foot. There are just too many mistakes across the board. And if we clean those up then we play a lot better ball than what we did today.”

(On his method for keeping the team together and morale up)

“First of all, every play that was a quote-unquote bad play is all 11 guys' fault. Every one of them. It is not pointing the finger at one guy here or one guy there. Because there isn't any one of us who played a perfect game today. So it is just about cleaning it up. And it is like, hey, as long as we look out for each other, and we have each other's back, we communicate better. We slow the game down faster. We do not take two drives to slow the game down and start executing. We start executing from the jump. We want to have a better shot.”

(On what the challenge Drake Maye was today)

“Drake is just a consistent guy. Coach (Mike) Vrabel does a great job. You can tell that they are well-coached. It's a fundamental game plan. They didn't do a whole lot. It's about fundamentals, eye control, discipline, and gap integrity. And he managed the game well. They had some long

drives there that ate up a lot of clock. And then a couple of times in the game, he made plays with his feet when he needed to. But for the most part, he stayed calm and collected. So I think he did a good job.”

(On Alvin Kamara’s desire to remain in New Orleans despite the trade rumors and what culture that sets for the team)

“Yeah, your veterans set the culture of the team. And that is one thing that I do think that we have right. Our veterans here set the culture of the team in the right way. We have just got to execute better. Alvin, the way that he carries himself as a leader, especially through his play. I think that Spence (Rattler) has been doing more than enough. There are things that we can all do to get better, but I thought our offense played well and kept us in the game, especially in the first half. They did a lot to help us out defensively. But as long as your leaders stick together and your leaders remain tight, it doesn't turn toxic or the locker room (doesn't) start falling apart. Because we've all seen those teams. I've been on teams like that before in my career. So, we don't let it get to that point. There's always time to turn it around. We haven't played a single divisional game yet, right? So everything that we want going to the playoffs and beyond, everything that we want is still in front of us. So, we're going to continue to attack that next.”

(On what was troublesome about his matchup against Kayshon Boutte)

“He is just a talented kid. We knew coming into the game that he wins a lot of 50-50 balls. That is how I view him. It is like, hey, if we want to take a 50-50 shot, the ball is going to go to number nine. And he won a couple of them. And, yeah, that's what happened.”

QB SPENCER RATTLER

(On the offense today)

“I thought it was a game where we moved the ball really well in the first half. We had some great plays. We had some big plays. We could have been a little better on third down. I think we were third and long on a couple of those. We could have finished in the red zone a little more. There were a few plays here and there. It didn't feel like we played poorly. That's the thing. We were a few plays away. We just have to figure out a way to make those plays.”

(On the frustration of losing a few games by a few plays)

“It's tough, but that's football especially at this level. You change a few plays and win the game. We have to take advantage of the opportunities. We have to make more plays than them. They made more plays than us and we have to figure out how to make more plays than them.”

(On the missed wheel route to Chris Olave near the end zone)

“It was a well-executed play. It is a tough one. We worked on that all week and felt great about it. We had the right look and almost made the play.”

(On Olave's dropped passes)

"I'm not worried about him. He is one of our best guys and we are going to keep getting him the ball. We rely on him, and our confidence is high on him."

(On missing on the red zone on the opening drive)

"We got down there and ran a keeper. Then we were at second and five or second and six. We ran the ball and then I think it was third and four. We had man coverage on third and four. We had the look. They brought safety pressure. It was hot. I had to get the ball out. They covered it well. We got a field goal from there. It's just little plays like that. You just have to find a way to make them. It's a collective thing for sure. We know that."

(On the mood in the locker room)

"It is similar to the other games when we came up short. We are right there playing against really good teams. We are right there. We are not happy about the loss. We know that we are a better team than our record says."

(On if it is more frustrating to lose when you have a shot in the fourth quarter)

"Yes, for sure. We have to figure out a way to finish in those fourth quarters. It's as simple as that."

(On the frustration of losing close games)

"Like I said earlier, we know that we are a better team than our record says. We have to find a way to win these one-score games. We have opportunities and it is a collective thing. We have to work on executing during the game."

(On his thoughts on opening the game with a big play)

"We knew that we were going to call that play the last few days. They brought an unscouted look and blitzed the corner. They had a safety on Chris (Olave). I created a little time and put it out there for him. After that play, we were like we are going to roll now. Let's roll. I hate to end up with three on that drive. I thought for sure it would be a touchdown. We have to figure out a way no matter what it is to get seven points up on the board especially after a big play like that."

(On Drake Maye's performance)

"He's a good quarterback. He has a great feel for the pocket. He can use his legs. He can see the field well. He had some nice designed plays today. He had some open stuff and he hit it. It is as simple as that. They executed. They executed more than us. He had a good day. He made some great plays. They had a good game plan and just made some more plays than us. "

(On if he had to prove anything today)

"I want to put my best foot forward every game. I do not want to go out there and look back. I want to go there and be sharp, play clean and make some plays. I want to keep us in the game."

Ultimately, we did not win the game. It is a team thing. We have a lot of playmakers on this team. We have a lot of great players. Like I said earlier, we are not playing like our record says. We have to figure out a way to finish these games out.”

(On setting a career-high on yards per attempt and taking more shots down the field)

“I think it is the confidence in our group. We have playmakers. I’m seeing the field well right now. We are getting in good calls. They didn’t do much to stop us early on. We moved the ball really well throwing the ball. I thought we could have ran the ball better today. We have to figure out a way to execute if we are throwing it or running it in the third down or red zone. You name it. It is a group thing. We have to clean it up.”

WR DeMARIO DOUGLAS

(On his reaction to today's game)

"It's a blessing. I know this team when we play for 60 minutes, and I got nothing but faith with this team. This is how close we are, I feel like we play on the field for each other. It's not a selfish anything, we are on the field playing for each other."

(On offense spreading the wealth and not getting the ball every game)

"I think it's been good for me, just for, I say (in) chapel and things like that. God's been speaking to me, and I feel like that's what been helping me, go in and keeping my injury right. Last couple chapels have been like stay patient and like the mountain, to get to the top of the mountain you need to go through obstacles. It's definitely different for me, not getting as much play time or stuff like that. But man, I felt like this is what I needed. It helps me play for the team, it takes all that selfish stuff out, it's not me, it's not a me game. It feels good, it feels good to win and play for the team."

(On what he saw for his first touchdown)

"I didn't not see that ball over there, I was excited man. Coach told me, 'I'm going to call it', I'm going to call it early. In practice it was hitting, and then you know my boy School (Brenden Schooler) told me, 'I am not going to lie that play is going to work', and I got in the end zone, bless it."

(On Drake Maye's play right now)

"I don't even think, it's not a surprise man. I know what he can do, he's been balling and doing his thing. And that confidence is growing, confidence growing and I'm proud of him."

(On having a QB that can make plays that aren't drawn up that way)

"The highest that confidence can go, that's where my confidence is at. The team is behind him, and you can see it, how we play for him, get open for him, and make life easier for him."

(On reaction to the pass interference call on Stefon Diggs that nullified a touchdown reception of his)

"Yeah, I did not even know at first, I went to the sideline. And they were like there is a flag and I was like man. But it's like that next play mentality, we got to go get another touchdown then, Kayshon [Boutte] went to score. It stayed in our room, so I'm happy about that."

T WILL CAMPBELL

(On returning to New Orleans)

"It was pretty special, I grew up coming to games here, I played my first college game ever here, so to play here is pretty cool."

(On amount of family at the game)

"People that are somewhat close to me, I probably had about, 60, and then the rest of the town where I grew up, had a bunch so I had a lot of support, a lot of New England fans."

(On how the line's protection was today)

"I think we did fine, you know there is a lot to clean up. One didn't go how we wanted it to, in the second half but we were still able to get the win so that's what matters. Kind of just like Coach (Vrabel) says it's a good feeling when you feel like you can correct a lot, you still get a win. Because you know that means we're not scratching the surface yet. So we just got to go in, make the corrections, get better, fix what we did wrong."

(On Kayshon Boutte's performance)

"I'm super happy for him. Being able, my first game ever in college, like I said, I was out there with him. And he is the same now, so just being able to watch him grow, and live and make explosive plays, like I know he can, and (that) has been his life since high school. It is really cool, and I am super happy for him."

(On the winning pattern of the team the past few games)

"We just do a good job of finding ways to win. We got to work for each other, offense and defense. So, we got a lot to correct, we just got back to work and get ready for Tennessee."

(On not having a letdown from a win)

"You know it doesn't really matter who we play, you have to have the 24-hour rule. Celebrate the win, can't take wins for granted in the league. But at the same time its only Week Six, we got a lot more season left to go. So, we can't rest on our rule about that game."

QB DRAKE MAYE

(On how good was it to leave with a win)

"Anytime coach has said 'You guys celebrate winning this league' no matter how it is or how much we could have played better and how much we left out on the plate. The Saints are a good team and have some good players, and they played hard. It was tough here playing at their place , so I'm just proud of the guys for leaving here with a win."

(On what does it mean for the team to trust you)

"I think it's trying to prove over and over again that you'll be consistent, and doing that you'll know to be smart with the football. The biggest thing in that situation is to try to get first down, safely throw into the sideline; what a play by (Kayshon) Boutte! It felt right being back home for him."

(On what does it feel like to be leading)

"We have more work to do, I think that's the big thing. It feels good getting a win consistently; three in a row and we have to keep going. It feels good to win again and to win on the road, it's always nice to win on the road. I'm just trying to step up leadership wise. The defense played and covered us in the second half. "

(On the drive that had an OPI penalty but that ended with a touchdown)

"It was huge and it was a really late call, we were almost on the sideline and I was about to sit down. I think just coming back, battling and picking up a couple consistent drives in the first half and then Boutte with a great play in the back of the end zone. I was trying to give him a chance one-on-one. One-on-one opens this league and you get to know that. It left some out there coming out of the half, in the second half first drive and that was a bummer but we have to keep going."

(On the opinion on the team's early progress compared to last year)

"Go to get win number five is my only thought. Last year is in the past and we are trying to keep building from that and hopefully keep showing up every week and be a tough team to play on the road. Winning at home is what we're trying to build, so I think we're on the way to that. It was a great team win with all the guys brought in."

WR KAYSHON BOUTTE

(On how much trust Drake Maye has in him)

“We work on it every day at practice, before practice and after practice. As long as we’re trusting each other, anything is possible.”

(On the fourth quarter game-sealing play on third-and-11)

“Press coverage; had an out route averted to a fade. It was a big play in a big moment.”

(On how he stays engaged and doesn’t get frustrated when not getting the ball regularly)

“I think you can only control what you can control. I think if you whine too much about not getting opportunities, sometimes when the ball comes your way you’re not going to make the play. I think it’s really about being dialed in throughout the whole game because at any given moment the ball is yours.”

(On making contested catches)

“I think I’m good at contested catches honestly. It’s something I’ve been doing since college at LSU and it just transferred over to the NFL.”

(On playing with Will Campbell)

“It means a lot, we played together when I was there (Louisiana State University), so we already have that bond and chemistry. Even throughout last year he was texting me, telling them to please draft me here, so he wanted to be here. So now that he’s here it’s great; great guy great energy i love it.”

(On how it feels to be about to prove you’re a developing NFL player)

“I would say three-four years ago I wasn’t in the best position, a lot of off the field stuff. I look at myself like I have been through a lot, and I feel like I am finally getting back together and everything is becoming good. I feel like it’s good to beat the adversity and just keep working.”

(On Drake Maye’s improvement)

“I think Drake trusts all of us. I think that’s the biggest thing and efficient offense with the quarterback trusting his receivers to make plays. Sometimes we’re not open, and when coverage is clouded, he plays himself. We trust that he can run with the ball and get the first, and he did get a couple firsts in critical situations. Trusting each other go a long way.”

Question: What was seen to call offensive pass interference on Stefon Diggs that nullified a touchdown catch by DeMario Douglas?

Adrian Hill: “On that play, we ruled blocking downfield by number eight, early during the play. So, if there is a situation where a player blocks downfield, it’s not a foul until a pass is thrown, so you kind of put that in the bank. And then the pass was thrown downfield later, that created the offensive pass interference.

Question: “The follow up question, mechanically, with the later timing of the penalty and subsequent announcement as both teams had their special teams units on the field, how did that unfold, the timing?

Hill: “The official was processing the play and then he came to me over the O20 (official-to-official communications system). Because it was a long-developing play, he had to rewind back to what happened at the beginning of the play, and process that.”

- With the 25-19 loss against the Patriots, the Saints now drop to 1-5 on the season.
- Up next, the Black and Gold travel to Chicago to play the Bears at Soldier Field. Kickoff is set for 12:00 p.m. CT and will be broadcast regionally on FOX (WVUE FOX 8 locally).
- QB **Spencer Rattler** went 20-for-26 (career-high 76.9 pct.) for 227 yards and rushed four times for 20 yards, posting a 102.6 passer rating.
- RB **Alvin Kamara** led the effort on the ground while doing work on the receiving end as well, finishing with 31 yards rushing and five catches for 45 yards. RB **Kendre Miller** also carried for 21 yards in the rushing attack.
- Kamara's 45 receiving yards receiving passed former Saint Darren Sproles, Christian McCaffrey (plays at Tampa Bay, 3:25 CT) and Herschel Walker to move into 11th all-time for receiving yards by a running back (4,884). In overall Saints history, he surpassed Danny Abramowicz to move into fifth all-time in club record books.
- Kamara's 31 rushing yards passed Nick Chubb of the Houston Texans for 71st all-time in NFL record books.
- With his 76 scrimmage yard performance vs. the Patriots, Kamara moved past WR Don Maynard, RB Chris Johnson, Pro Football Hall of Fame WR Michael Irvin and RB Clinton Portis to advance to 71st all-time in NFL history (11,977).
- Kamara also played in his 121st game, moving into sole possession of 33rd on the club's games played list, surpassing LB Vaughan Johnson.
- WR **Chris Olave** led the receiver room with six catches for 98 yards. WR **Rashid Shaheed** had four catches for 28 yards to go with two punt returns for 21 yards.
- Olave tied his career-long reception on the first play from scrimmage of the game, a 53-yard connection from Rattler. The last time he had a catch that long was in his rookie year against the Los Angeles Rams (11/20/22).
- QB **Taysom Hill** rushed one time for a one-yard touchdown.
- Hill also played in his 107th career regular season game, moving into a tie for 44th on the club's all-time list with LB Pat Swilling and S Gene Atkins.

- Defensively, New Orleans held the New England rushing attack to only 73 yards on 31 carries. The 2.35 opponent yards per carry was the 41st-lowest in a single game in franchise history and the lowest figure since the 2021 season.
- LB **Pete Werner** accumulated five solo tackles, one sack and one pass breakup. He now has two takedowns this season setting a new career-high.
- DTs **Davon Godchaux** led the tackling effort today with seven total stops (three solo). Werner, CB **Alontae Taylor**, S **Jonas Sanker** and DT **Bryan Bresee** also contributed, all tallying five tackles each. Bresee's five stops are a career-high for him.
- LB **Demario Davis** played in his 120th game as a Saint against the Patriots to move into a tie for 33rd on the club's games played list with LB Vaughan Johnson. He also played in his 216th career game on Sunday, moving into a tie for 13th all-time for appearances by linebackers with Darryl Talley. Davis finished with three tackles (two solo), including one stop for loss.
- DE **Cameron Jordan** moved into a tie for tenth all-time among defensive linemen in games played with Pro Football Hall of Fame defensive ends Reggie White and Chris Doleman.
- K **Blake Grupe** knocked in all four of his field goals today (34, 38, 48 and 54 yards) and drilled his lone PAT attempt. This was the fifth game of Grupe's career with at least four field goals. With four field goals last week against the New York Giants, this was his first back-to-back performance of at least four successful kicks.
- LS **Zach Wood** played in his 138th career game on Sunday, moving into a tie for 21st in Saints history with C John Hill.
- LB **Isaiah Stalbird** led the team with three special teams tackles to up his team-leading season total to 11, while also adding his first career defensive stop.
