### THE MATCHUP

The New Orleans Saints [2-6] look to bounce back this week and reverse a six-game losing streak in playing in their last road contest until December 8, when they play the Carolina Panthers [1-7] in a division contest at Bank of America Stadium.

The Saints will be looking to improve their record to 3-6 leading into three straight home games and even up their division record at 2-2, while sweeping the Panthers in consecutive seasons for the first time since the 2019-20 campaigns.

New Orleans holds a 31-28 regular season advantage over the Panthers in the series and the Saints have won nine of the last 13 dating back to 2018. In a memorable 2024 season opener at the Caesars Superdome, New Orleans put together a dominating 47-10 victory over the Panthers, the team's most complete performance of the season. QB **Derek Carr** completed 19-of-23 passes [82.6 pct.] for 200 yards with three touchdown passes, zero interceptions and a 142.5 passer rating, helping the Saints score on their first nine offensive possessions. With Carr having missed the last three games with an oblique injury suffered on October 7, at Kansas City, he is trending closer to returning to action through the rehabilitation process.

The Saints come into Sunday's contest following a 26-8 loss at the Los Angeles Chargers. Sunday's game marked the return to action of several starters who had missed significant time due to injuries in TE **Taysom Hill**, WR **Chris Olave**, C/G **Cesar Ruiz** and LB **Peter Werner**, with those players making an impact as the team seeks to return to full strength on the field.

Hill made an astute play on special teams on a botched punt attempt with the football going into the back of the end zone and resulting in a safety. Olave had his most productive game of the season, recording eight receptions for 107 yards. Ruiz blocked for several big gains in the passing game and run game. Werner helped shore up the team's run defense with nine tackles to tie for the team lead. As New Orleans continues a return to health, the hope is for a return to the complementary style that got the club off to a 2-0 start. Carolina dropped to 1-7 on Sunday, following a 28-14 loss at the Denver Broncos.

## THE HEAD COACHES



Dennis Allen was hired as the 17th head coach in New Orleans Saints history on February 8, 2022. Now in his 29th year coaching and 23rd in the NFL, Allen has spent 14 seasons

in New Orleans in two separate stints, including six-and-a-half campaigns (2015-21) as the team's defensive coordinator prior to being promoted to head coach.

During his 23 years of coaching in the NFL, Allen has worked with 13 players who have combined for 26 Pro Bowl selections and he has also coached two *Associated Press* NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year winners and three members of the Pro Football Hall of Fame.

Allen's defenses have consistently been among the most productive in the NFL in a number of categories, including scoring defense, total yards allowed and sacks. The team's defensive play-caller since the middle of the 2015 season, the Saints are the only team in the National Football League to rank in the top ten in opponent points per game each of the past four seasons.

In 2023, Allen guided the Saints to win four of their last five games as the team turned in a 9-8 performance, narrowly missing the playoffs. New Orleans finished 5-3 at home, winning their last three at the Caesars Superdome and captured their last three division contests, including convincing victories over Tampa Bay and Atlanta to close the season.

Prior to rejoining the Saints in 2015, Allen served as head coach of the Oakland Raiders from 2012-14 and as defensive coordinator of the Denver Broncos in 2011.

Allen played safety at Texas A&M from 1992-95, where he started the final 21 games of his career before being signed as an undrafted free agent by the Buffalo Bills in 1996. Prior to entering the National Football League coaching ranks in 2002, Allen served as a graduate assistant at his alma mater from 1996-99 and as a secondary coach at the University of Tulsa from 2000-01. He earned a bachelor of business administration degree and a master's in kinesiology from Texas A&M.

Raised in Hurst, Texas, Allen and his wife Alisson have a daughter, Layla and a son, Garrison.



Dave Canales is in his first season as head coach for the Panthers. Canales comes to Carolina having spent his first 13 seasons in the NFL with the Seattle Seahawks (2010-22) in various roles on the offensive side of the ball,

prior to serving as the offensive coordinator of the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2023.

In his lone season as offensive coordinator with the Buccaneers, quarterback Baker Mayfield set career highs in passing yards (4,044), completion percentage (64.3), touchdown passes (28) and completions (364). He was one of just two NFL quarterbacks to throw 27-plus touchdowns with 10-or-fewer interceptions on the season.

Canales joined the Buccaneers after 13 seasons with the Seahawks, where he helped Seattle to ten playoff appearances, two conference championships and a Super Bowl LVIII title. Canales originally joined the Seahawks as an offensive quality control coach (2010-12) before being elevated to assistant quarterbacks coach (2013-14) and later wide receivers coach (2015-17), quarterbacks coach (2018-19, 2022) and pass game coordinator (2020-21).

As quarterbacks coach in 2022, Canales helped guide Geno Smith to his first career Pro Bowl selection and Comeback Player of the Year honors from the AP and PFWA. Smith was also named the NFL's Most Improved Player by the PFWA after leading the NFL with a 69.8 completion percentage and setting career highs in completions (399), passing yards (4,282) and passing touchdowns (30).

The Seahawks excelled offensively, during Canales' tenure in Seattle, recording 7.61 passing yards per attempt and 4.53 rushing yards per carry over the 13-year run. Seattle was the only offense to rank in the top five in both of these categories during that span. Under Canales' tutelage, quarterback Russell Wilson joined Peyton Manning as the only players in league history with 3,000-or-more passing yards and 20-plus passing touchdowns in each of their first 10 seasons.

Canales played wide receiver at Azusa Pacific from 1999-2003 and started his coaching career at El Camino College (2006-08) and USC (2009), before entering the NFL ranks. Canales, a Carson, Calif. native and his wife, Lizzy, have four children.

## SERIES HISTORY

The Carolina Panthers initially entered the National Football League as an expansion franchise in 1995 and since then, the Saints lead the regular season series 31-28, with New Orleans also picking up the home 2017 NFC Wild Card showdown. The clubs were in the NFC West together from 1995-2001 and the rivalry has continued since it was formed in 2002 divisional realignment. The Saints have a 15-14 edge at contests played on the road road. Of the 59 regular season games in the series, 29 have been decided by eight points or less, with the Saints winning 15 of them.

In the 59 regular season games of the series there has been:

- 1,317 points scored by New Orleans, 1,229 allowed.
- A five-game New Orleans winning streak from 2000-02.
- A four-game New Orleans winning streak in games played at the Caesars Superdome from 1998-2001 and a four-game winning streak at contests played at Bank of America Stadium from 2017-20.
- 29 games decided by double-digits.
- nine games decided by 21 or more points.
- 29 games decided by eight points or less.
- One 37-point win in the Saints' 2024 season-opening 47-10 victory.
- A 32-point loss by New Orleans.

## 2024 GAME SUMMARIES

**WEEK 1: Saints 47, Panthers 10; Sept. 8, 2024 @ Caesars Superdome** - The Saints, behind three **Derek Carr** touchdown passes, two rushing touchdowns and four **Blake Grupe** field goals, defeated the visiting Carolina Panthers, 47-10, at the Caesars Superdome.

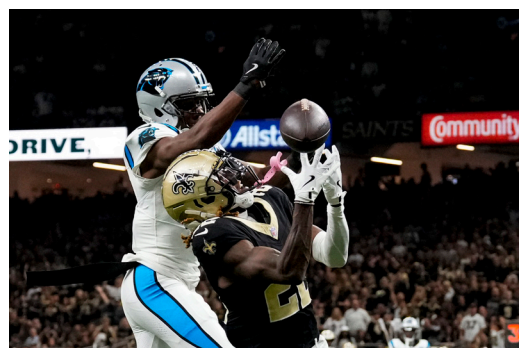
The Saints jumped out to a 30-0 lead, scored on their first nine possessions (tying a club record for scores on consecutive possessions) and held the ball for 36:39 in time of possession en route to the highest scoring total and most lopsided opening day result in team history. New Orleans won their sixth consecutive season opener, a club record and the current longest opener winning streak in the NFL.

The New Orleans defense also displayed their mettle, allowing only 193 total net yards of offense by the Panthers and held the Panthers to just one of ten third downs.

The Saints defense recorded three takeaways and CB **Alontae Taylor** became the first Saints defensive back to record three sacks in a contest, but fans were excited by the debut of a new-look offense that helped the Saints control the clock with a rushing game that gained 180 yards and two touchdowns largely behind **Alvin Kamara's** 83 yards. Carr completed 19-of-23 passes (82.6 pct.) for 200 yards with three touchdown passes, zero interceptions and a 142.5 passer rating. The New Orleans defense harassed Carolina QB **Bryce Young** all day, as he completed only 13-of-30 passes for 161 yards with two interceptions and a 32.8 passer rating.

- With the victory, the Saints improved to 23-35 in season openers and extend their club-record winning streak of season openers to six straight, currently the longest streak in the National Football league.
- WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed** led New Orleans with 73 receiving yards on three receptions (24.3 avg.) with one touchdown reception from 59 yards out, the longest play of the game. Including 60 punt return yards, sparked by a 47-yard runback and a 33-yard kickoff return, Shaheed finished with 163 all-purpose yards to start the season.

- Carr connected with two of his tight ends, **Juwan Johnson** and **Foster Moreau** for touchdowns.
- 17 players made their Saints debuts: T **Taliese Fuaga**, G **Lucas Patrick**, LB **Willie Gay Jr.**, DB **Will Harris**, QB **Jake Haener**, WR **Cedrick Wilson Jr.**, CB **Kool-Aid McKinstry**, WR **Bub Means**, CB **Rico Payton**, P **Matthew Hayball**, LB **Khaleke Hudson**, LB **Anfernee Orji**, OL **Oli Udoh**, WR **Mason Tipton**, DTs **Kendal Vickers** and **Khristian Boyd** and DE **Chase Young**.
- With 83 yards rushing and five receptions for 27 yards, Kamara's 110 total yards from scrimmage gave him his 50th career game of at least 100 yards from scrimmage.



**WEEK 2: Saints 44, Cowboys 19; Sept. 15, 2024 @ AT&T Stadium** - The Saints posted an impressive road victory at Dallas behind the powerful offensive firepower of RB **Alvin Kamara**, the arm of QB **Derek Carr**, the hands of WRs **Chris Olave** and **Rashid Shaheed** and two interceptions by the defense.

The Saints struck first on the opening drive as Carr led the offense down the field on a sequence ending with Kamara rushing for a five-yard touchdown. At the conclusion of Dallas' first drive, K **Brandon Aubrey** booted a 52-yard field goal. New Orleans struck right back for their second score of the first quarter on a 70-yard pass play from Carr to Shaheed to put New Orleans up 14-3.

Leading 35-16 at halftime, the Cowboys got the ball out of the second half and New Orleans moved Dallas out of the red zone in the first drive, when DT **Bryan Bresee** sacked QB **Dak Prescott** and forced him to fumble before it was recovered by Dallas at the New Orleans 22-yard line, forcing a 40-yard field goal. On New Orleans' next 13-play, 70-yard drive, Kamara capped things off with a seven-yard touchdown, his fourth score of the day.

## SAINTS AT DALLAS (CONT.)

In the fourth quarter, Carr was intercepted on a tipped pass, but on the next play, New Orleans got the ball back on an interception by S **Tyrann Mathieu**, his second takeaway of the season. On the ensuing drive, New Orleans closed out the scoring in the contest with a 26-yard field goal by K **Blake Grupe**. Carr completed 11-of-16 passes for 243 yards with two touchdown throws and one interception, while scoring one rushing touchdown for a 125.0 passer rating. Kamara led the club in rushing with a game-high 115 yards on 20 carries with three touchdowns to go with two receptions for 65 yards, including a career-long 57-yard scoring grab on a screen pass. Shaheed led the Saints in receiving with four grabs for 96 yards with the deep touchdown, reaching the end zone in his third consecutive contest dating back to 2023.

The Saints defense harassed Prescott, sacking him three times and forcing two interceptions. CB **Alontae Taylor** led the team with a career-high nine tackles, while CB **Paulson Adebo** had his first interception of the season and DE **Carl Granderson** picked up 1.5 sacks.

- The win marked the first time the Saints have won in Dallas since a 34-31 overtime victory on December 23, 2012.
- Carr's two touchdown passes moved him into a tie for 26th all-time with Boomer Esiason. With his next scoring pass, he will move into a tie for 25th with Tony Romo.
- Shaheed's career-long 70-yard touchdown reception gives him eight career touchdowns on offense and special teams.
- Mathieu's interception was the 34th of his career since coming into the league in 2013, the most in the NFL over that time.
- A stingy Saints run defense held the Cowboys to 68 yards rushing on 21 carries [3.2 avg.].
- The 91 points by New Orleans in their first two games are tied for the second-most in NFL history through the first two games of a season, behind the Saints' 93 point total in 2009.



**WEEK 3: Eagles 15, Saints 12; Sept. 22, 2024 @ Caesars Superdome** - Philadelphia S **Reed Blankenship** intercepted Saints QB **Derek Carr** with 48 seconds left to preserve a 15-12 win over New Orleans in the Caesars Superdome.

The Saints had overcome an unsuccessful fourth-and-one conversion attempts and a 65-yard touchdown run by Eagles RB **Saquon Barkley** to take the lead in the fourth quarter with just over two minutes left, 12-7, with a field goal and a 13-yard touchdown connection from Carr and WR **Chris Olave**.

However, upon the Eagles getting the ball back, Philadelphia QB **Jalen Hurts** completed a pass to TE **Dallas Goedert** for a 61-yard gain and Barkley punched in a touchdown from four yards in. The Eagles improved to 2-1, while the Saints fell to 2-1.

Carr completed 14-of-25 passes for 142 yards with one touchdown and one interception. Olave had six receptions for 86 yards, including a 13-yard touchdown catch. RB **Alvin Kamara** rushed for 87 yards and caught three passes for 40 yards from 127 total yards from scrimmage.

DE **Carl Granderson** had 1.5 sacks and a forced fumble and DT **Bryan Bresee** tied a career-high with two takedowns. S **Tyrann Mathieu** had an interception, giving him takeaways in four straight games for the first time in his career dating back to the 2023 season finale. CB **Paulson Adebo** led the team with a career-high ten solo tackles and one pass breakup.

- The loss snapped a four-game winning streak, and a four-game home win streak.
- For the third consecutive game, the Saints scored on their first offensive possession with the Grupe field goal. It marked the first time since Weeks 17 and 18 of the 2022 season and the 2023 season opener, that the Saints scored on their opening possession in three consecutive games.

## EAGLES VS. SAINTS (CONT.)

- Mathieu's interception was the 35th of his career since coming into the league in 2013. He and Minnesota's Harrison Smith are tied as the NFL's interception leaders among active players.
- Dating back to Week 17 of the 2023 season, New Orleans has won the takeaway battle in five consecutive contests.

**WEEK 4: Atlanta Falcons 26, Saints 24; September 29, 2024 @ Mercedes-Benz Stadium** - Despite several significant injuries going into the contest and in-game, the Saints took the Falcons to the limit before dropping a 26-24 heartbreaker at Mercedes-Benz Stadium.

Atlanta kicker **Younghoe Koo's** 58-yard field goal with two seconds left was the difference. New Orleans rebounded from a fumbled punt return for a touchdown early in the first quarter to reach the end zone on rushing touchdowns by TE **Taysom Hill** on their first two offensive possessions, his first two scores of the season, before departing with an abdomen injury.

Atlanta took the lead back in the second quarter at 17-14 on a 53-yard Koo field goal and a 44-yard **Troy Andersen** interception return for a touchdown. Koo added to the scoring with a 44-yard field goal midway through the third quarter and then **Blake Grupe** and Koo traded field goals with the Falcons taking the end for the majority of the third and fourth quarters until QB **Derek Carr** engineered a nine-play, 42-yard drive ending with a one-yard touchdown run by RB **Alvin Kamara** with one minute left to pull ahead, 24-23. But Atlanta rallied, as the Falcons gained 30 yards on a pass interference penalty to set up Koo's 58-yard kick.

**WEEK 5: Kansas City Chiefs 26, Saints 13; October 7, 2024 @ GEHA Field at Arrowhead Stadium** - Despite missing five starters due to various injuries, the New Orleans Saints put forth a valiant effort in a 26-13 loss to the defending Super Bowl champion Kansas City Chiefs on Monday Night Football, closing to within three points early in the fourth quarter before the Chiefs had a late ten-point scoring outburst.

After falling behind 10-0 in the contest, New Orleans moved to within three points midway through the second quarter when QB **Derek Carr** found WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed** for a 43-yard touchdown pass to cap a seven-play, 74-yard drive.

But after Kansas City milked the clock for a 15-play, 44-yard drive that ended with a 34-yard field goal by K **Harrison Butker**, the Chiefs forced a quick three-and-out and drove down the field for a 28-yard field goal. The two successful kicks late in the second quarter gave the Chiefs a 13-7 halftime lead.

New Orleans would rally with a 37-yard interception return by DT **Khalen Saunders** that set up a six-yard touchdown connection between Carr and TE **Foster Moreau**, but the Chiefs then ran down the field in five-plays and 68 yards, extending their lead to ten on a three-yard rushing touchdown by rookie WR **Xavier Worthy**.

**WEEK 6: Tampa Bay Buccaneers 51, Saints 27; October 13, 2024 @ Caesars Superdome** - With the Buccaneers evacuated to New Orleans for their practice week due to Hurricane Milton, the Saints got caught in a storm of emotion and offensive production by Tampa Bay in a loss that dropped them to 2-4. Tampa Bay, who scored 24 unanswered points in the second half after trailing 27-24 at halftime, had 595 total yards of offense.

In the contest, QB **Spencer Rattler** made his first career NFL start in place of an injured **Derek Carr** [oblique]. Rattler completed 22-of-40 passes for 243 yards with a ten-yard touchdown pass to fellow rookie wide receiver **Bub Means** and two interceptions. Rattler also utilized his feet with four carries for 27 yards.

Buccaneers QB **Baker Mayfield** overcame three second quarter interceptions to complete 24-of-36 passes for 325 yards with four touchdown passes. He was aided by a ground game that added 277 yards and two touchdowns.

Mayfield and the Buccaneers jumped out to a 17-0 first quarter lead, but New Orleans would rally. Special teams provided a spark to put the team back into it. WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed** returned a punt 54 yards for a touchdown early in the second quarter to put the Saints within seven. On Tampa Bay's next possession, CB **Paulson Adebo** intercepted Mayfield and K **Blake Grupe** drilled a 29-yard field goal.

## TAMPA BAY VS. SAINTS (CONT.)

Two plays after the field goal, S **Johnathan Abram** intercepted a tipped pass and returned it 30 yards to the Tampa Bay ten-yard line. Rattler then connected with fellow rookie WR **Bub Means** for a ten-yard touchdown to put New Orleans ahead 20-17. After Tampa Bay took the lead quickly on a Mayfield touchdown pass, the Saints responded with a seven-play, 70-yard drive that ended with a four-yard rushing touchdown by RB **Alvin Kamara** to give the Saints what would be a 27-24 halftime lead.

The two clubs traded punts on the first two possessions of the third quarter, but on New Orleans' second possession of the quarter, Tampa Bay turned up the heat on Rattler with two straight sacks on first and second down, forcing a punt. On Tampa Bay's next drive, Mayfield connected with WR **Chris Godwin** on a 55-yard touchdown to give the Buccaneers the lead for good on the afternoon.

**WEEK 7: Denver Broncos 33, Saints 10; October 17, 2024 @ Caesars Superdome** - Difficulties on third down and a standout performance on the ground by the Broncos offense combined to give the Saints their fifth consecutive loss.

The Broncos and Saints traded punts on their first possessions. Denver scored when they got the ball back for their second possession on a 46-yard **Wil Lutz** field goal. Broncos LB **Cody Barton** then sacked Saints QB **Spencer Rattler** and forced him to fumble with the recovery by LB **Kwon Alexander**. at the Denver 45-yard line, setting up for a 32-yard Lutz field goal.

The Saints were forced to punt on their first possession of the second quarter and Broncos QB **Bo Nix** engineered an eight-play, 86-yard drive that ended with an eight-yard touchdown run by RB **Javonte Williams** to give Denver a 13-0 lead. Nix matched a Saints field goal on his and Denver's next possession, successfully running a two-minute drill that gave the Broncos a 16-3 halftime lead following a 52-yard Lutz field goal.

Denver broke open the contest in the third quarter, where they forced three New Orleans punts and added on a 38-yard field goal by Lutz and a five-yard rushing touchdown by Williams to take a 26-3 edge going into the final period.

The Broncos scored their final points of the evening with just over four minutes remaining in the fourth quarter when CB **Ja'Quan McMillian** sacked Rattler and forced him to fumble, with the ball recovered by Barton and returned 52 yards for a touchdown. With QB **Jake Haener** entering the contest to allow Rattler to rest a hip pointer injury, New Orleans would achieve some offensive rhythm to end the contest when Haener engineered a 11-play, 79-yard drive that ended with a 12-yard touchdown pass to WR **Cedrick Wilson Jr.**, the second-year signal-caller's first career touchdown pass and the sixth-year wideout's first scoring grab as a Saint.



**WEEK 8: Los Angeles Chargers 26, Saints 8; October 27, 2024 @ SoFi Stadium** - Los Angeles QB **Justin Herbert** threw two touchdowns and had a career-long 38-yard rush, while RB **J.K. Dobbins** rushed for 57 yards and pounded in a score to erase an early 2-0 deficit in the Saints' return to Southern California, where they held the first portion of their training camp.

The early lead for New Orleans came on an abated punt play, where long snapper **Josh Harris** fumbled the ball and when it was picked up by P **JK Scott**, TE **Taysom Hill** tackled him and forced him to fumble with the ball going out of the end zone for a safety. Late in the first quarter, Herbert carried for a 38-yard gain on a drive and the early Saints lead was erased by a 46-yard **Cameron Dicker** field goal on the first play of the second quarter. In the second quarter, Los Angeles embarked on a 15-play, 90-yard drive that ended with a one-yard rushing touchdown by Dobbins, which following a missed extra point, extended the lead to 9-2. New Orleans got the ball back with 1:37 left in the first half at their 30 and drove to cut the deficit to 9-5 on a 40-yard field goal by **Blake Grupe**.

## SAINTS AT L.A. CHARGERS (CONT.)

The Chargers took a 16-5 lead on a 60-yard touchdown connection from Herbert to WR **Ladd McConkey**. New Orleans got the ball back and took advantage of a Chargers unnecessary roughness penalty, followed two plays later by a 14-yard completion from QB **Spencer Rattler** to WR **Chris Olave** to the Los Angeles 38-yard line. However, a holding penalty assessed to T **Trevor Penning** knocked New Orleans out of field goal range. The Saints then forced a three and out, powered by a sack by DT **Khalen Saunders** and QB **Jake Haener** entered the contest in place of Rattler. Haener, then led New Orleans on eight-play drive that ended with a 43-yard field goal to put the Saints within eight.

On the next drive that led into the fourth quarter, Herbert connected with WR **Joshua Palmer** for a 45-yard gain, that set up a 29-yard field goal. The clubs then traded punts on their next two possessions, with the Saints eventually reaching Chargers territory on a drive powered by a 28-yard connection from Haener to Olave. However New Orleans was set back by a failed 44-yard field goal attempt by Grupe. On the following possession, the Chargers drove 66 yards in nine plays and McConkey hauled in a nine-yard touchdown pass from Herbert for a 26-8 lead with 3:22 remaining.

Rattler was 12-of-24 passing for 156 yards and Haener completed nine-of-17 throws for 122 yards. Olave, who had missed the last game with a concussion, caught eight passes for 107 yards in the team's first 100-yard receiving performance of the season and the ninth of his career.

Los Angeles out-gained New Orleans, 378-366. The Saints were 2-for-16 on third down conversions, while the Chargers were only 3-of-12 on third down attempts.

## TEAM NOTES

## EVANS SELECTED TO SAINTS RING OF HONOR

Former Saints G Jahri Evans will be inducted into the club's Ring of Honor during a halftime ceremony of the team's contest against the Cleveland Browns on November 17.

Evans, 6-4, 318, was originally a fourth round draft pick (108th overall) of the Saints in 2006 out of Bloomsburg and developed into an anchor for one of the most dominant offenses in NFL history during his tenure with the Saints. The Philadelphia, Pa. native started all 169 regular season games he played in at right guard and all of the team's ten postseason contests during that period, including all three during the 2009 campaign when the Saints captured Super Bowl XLIV.

A five-time Associated Press All-Pro (2009-13), Evans was selected first-team four times, twice as much as any other Saint. Evans was selected to six straight Pro Bowls (2009-14) and was named to the Pro Football Hall of Fame's 2010's All-Decade Team. During his 11-year tenure, the Saints were ranked first in the NFL in total offense (net yards per game) six times (2006, 2008-09, 2011, 2014 and 2016) and in scoring (points per game) twice (2008-09). The 274 sacks surrendered by the Saints offensive line from 2006-16 were the lowest total in the NFL over the period and the unit was recognized twice (2009 and 2011) as the winner of the Madden Pro-tector Offensive Line Award.

Evans closed out his playing career starting 14 games at right guard for the Green Bay Packers in 2017, finishing with 183 total games played/started. A Pro Football Hall of Fame semifinalist in 2023 and finalist in 2024, Evans began his coaching career as an offensive assistant for the Saints in 2023.

**Offensive Coordinator Klint Kubiak** - Father, Gary, played quarterback for the Denver Broncos from 1983-91 and served as an assistant for 15 years for Denver, San Francisco and Minnesota. Gary Kubiak was head coach of the Houston Texans from 2006-13 and the Denver Broncos from 2015-16, including the Super Bowl 50 champions. Brother Klay, serves as the 49ers passing game specialist. Brother Klein works in the Dallas Cowboys player personnel department.

**Vice President/Asst. General Manager-College Personnel Jeff Ireland** - Stepson of Chiefs Hall of Fame linebacker/center E.J. Holub. Grandson of Philadelphia Eagles running back and Chicago Bears personnel executive Jim Parmer.

**National Scout Terry Wooden** - Brother, Jojo is Senior Director of Player Personnel for the Las Vegas Raiders.

**QB Derek Carr** - Older brother, David was the No. 1 overall pick in the 2002 NFL Draft by the Houston Texans and played quarterback in the league for 11 seasons with Houston, Carolina, the New York Giants and San Francisco. Uncle, Lon Boyett, played tight end for Tampa Bay, the Raiders and San Francisco.

On the Saints active roster as of October 17, 33 were on the active roster, a reserve list of the practice squad at the end of the 2023 season. Among newcomers, the roster includes seven unrestricted free agents, two veteran free agents, one trade acquisition, six draft picks and five rookie free agents.

Of the players, 23 have less than four years of previous NFL experience, including ten rookies. **BUCKING THE ODDS**

The Saints have a long tradition of finding players as free agents signed after the draft that make an impact immediately or after developing their careers initially on the practice squad. Several undrafted Saints on the roster play key roles on offense, defense and special teams, including six undrafted rookies who are on the 53-man roster.

Over the past 21 years, the Saints (2018-22: defensive back **J.T. Gray**, wide receiver/return specialist **Deonte Harty** and wide receiver/return specialist **Rashid Shaheed**) and San Diego/Los Angeles Chargers (2003: guard **Kris Dielman**, tight end **Antonio Gates** and wide receiver **Kasim Osgood**) are the only two teams to have three players signed as undrafted free agents be selected to a Pro Bowl for the team that originally signed them.

Originally signed as an undrafted free agent in 2018, spending part of his rookie season on the practice squad, Gray’s 81 special teams tackles since 2019 rank first in the NFL, as he has been selected as both an *Associated Press* first-team All-Pro and Pro Bowler. In 2023, the special teams captain finished the season with 11 coverage stops to lead the team and tie for 12th in the league, despite missing three contests with injuries. In 2024, he is ranked first on the team with 16 stops and had a blocked punt on Sept. 22 vs. Philadelphia, adding two solo defensive tackles and one forced fumble.

Defensive end **Carl Granderson** joined the club in 2019 as an undrafted free agent out of Wyoming and has appeared in 79 regular season games with 32 starts, posting 209 tackles (121 solo), 26 sacks for a loss of 166.5 yards, two passes defended, four forced fumbles and two recoveries. In 2023, Granderson earned the starting right end position and posted a career-high 78 tackles (44 solo), led the team with a career-best 8.5 sacks for a loss of 55 yards, defended one pass and forced a fumble and recovered one. Granderson’s 78 stops ranked fifth in the National Football League among defensive linemen and were the most by a Saints lineman since 2004. He has opened all eight games in 2024 and has recorded 30 tackles (18 solo), three sacks, four stops for loss and one forced fumble to lead the defensive line in stops.

after a graduate transfer season at Notre Dame and playing most of his college career at Arkansas State, kicker **Blake Grupe** won a preseason competition to handle placekicking duties and in two seasons, has drilled 43-of-51 field goal attempts (84.3 pct.), including 13-of-14 kicks (92.9 pct.) in 2024 with a career-long of 57 yards in the season-opening win over Carolina. Dating back to the Dec. 17, 2023 win over the New York Giants until a fourth quarter miss Sunday at the Los Angeles Chargers, Grupe has made 19 consecutive field goals, the longest streak of his career and tied for sixth-longest in franchise history.

New Orleans signed punter **Matthew Hayball** out of Vanderbilt following the NFL Draft. The West Adelaide, Australia native finished as Vandy's all-time leader in punting average (46.5) and was a consensus second-team All-American in 2023, when he ranked seventh nationally in net (43.1). Hayball won a training camp competition to secure the job. In eight games, he has punted 35 times with a 40.6 net punting average, with his 19 inside the 20-yard line tied for fifth in the NFL.

Joining New Orleans following the 2023 NFL Draft, Signing with New Orleans following the 2024 NFL Draft, guard **Kyle Hergel** appeared in 57 games with 56 starts along the offensive lines to North Dakota (2018-21), Texas State (2021-22) and Boston College (2023). An honorable mention All-ACC selection after starting all 13 games for the Eagles at left guard in 2023, Hergel engaged in competition along the offensive line in training camp and after spending the start of the season on the practice squad, has contributed on special teams in five contests in 2024 and seeing his first action on the offensive line on Oct. 17, vs. Denver.

Tight end **Dallin Holker** was signed by New Orleans after a standout graduate transfer campaign at Colorado State, where he posted 64 receptions for 767 yards with six touchdowns, the highest total of yardage and scoring grabs in the college regular season by an Football Bowl Subdivision tight end. Holker's performance in the offseason and training camp secured a roster spot behind Johnson, Taysom Hill and Foster Moreau.

Wide receiver **Jermaine Jackson** signed a college free agent contract in the spring, playing his final four years at Idaho after starting his college career at the College of San Mateo (Calif.). In 2023, the Oakland, Calif. native was one of the most dynamic returners in college, bringing back 18 punts for 332 yards (18.4 avg.) with two touchdowns to go with 18 kickoff returns for 478 yards (26.6 avg.) and 48 receptions for 593 yards (12.4 avg.) with two touchdowns. Following Shaheed's season-ending knee injury, Jackson has handled return duties in two contests, returning four punts for 43 yards (8.6 avg.) and five kickoffs for 122 yards (24.4 avg.).

Tight end **Juwan Johnson** first led Saints tight ends with four touchdown receptions in 2021, converting to the position that offseason after playing wideout in college and as a rookie in 2020, signed as an undrafted free agent from Oregon. In 2022, he led the Black and Gold tight ends in receiving with 42 grabs for 508 yards with a club-best and career-high seven touchdowns, tied for third at the position in the NFL. Johnson led the team's tight ends with 37 grabs for 368 yards with four touchdown grabs in 2023. Johnson has led the Saints with 12 receiving touchdowns over the past three seasons, tied for fourth over that period among league National Football League tight ends.

In 2024, Johnson quickly recovered from foot surgery in June and has played in all eight games, recording 18 receptions for 184 yards with one touchdown. Johnson has combined with Taysom Hill and Foster Moreau to form an effective tight end trio for quarterback Jake Haensler and Spencer Rattler in the absence of starter Derek Carr due to an oblique injury.

After originally signing as an undrafted free agent out of Vanderbilt in 2023, where he led the Commodores in tackles in each of his final three seasons, linebacker **Anfernee Orji** received the opportunity to see extensive snaps in practice in training camp due to injuries to teammates Demario Davis and Pete Werner. He ranks second on the team with ten coverage stops and has also added 15 defensive tackles. [nine solo].

Cornerback **Rico Payton** signed a college free agent contract in the spring, playing his final four years at Pittsburg State. As a senior in 2023, the St. Louis native recorded 35 tackles with four interceptions and 15 passes defensed. Payton secured a roster spot with his performance in training camp practices and preseason games, leading the team with five passes defensed and adding seven defensive tackles and one coverage stop in three contests. Payton has contributed on both defense and special teams in the first eight games with one pass breakup and six coverage stops, including a career-high two on Sunday at the L.A. Chargers.

Wide receiver **Mason Tipton** stuck on the 53-man roster after showing bright spots in training camp practices, following a college career at Yale, where he posted 132 receptions for 1,067 yards with 19 TDs. In 2024, he has 14 receptions for 99 yards.

The Saints have won a franchise-record six consecutive season openers dating back to 2019. The six-game opener winning streak is the longest current streak in the National Football League.

Playing in 88 career games, Gray has career totals of 83 special teams stops, two blocked punts, three fumble recoveries and 12 defensive tackles, 2.5 sacks, one forced fumble and a pass defense. **QUARTERBACKS**

**DEREK CARR**



On March 6, 2023, the Saints agreed to terms with Derek Carr on a four-year contract to solidify the quarterback position. He spent the first nine seasons of his NFL career with the Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders. Originally selected in the second round [36th overall] of the 2014 NFL Draft by the Raiders out of Fresno State, the Bakersfield, Calif. native has started all 164 career regular season games he has played in, the most starts at the position over that time, completing 3,666-of-5,634 passes [65.1 pct.] for 40,089 yards with 250 touchdown passes, 111 interceptions and a 92.5 passer rating, while adding 907 rushing yards and seven touchdowns. Since entering the league in 2014, Carr ranks first in the NFL in completions, second in passing yardage and sixth in passing touchdowns. He became the third quarterback in NFL history to pass for 3,000-plus yards in each of his first ten seasons, joining Pro Football Hall of Fame signal-caller Peyton Manning and Russell Wilson. He is just the seventh player in NFL history to reach 40,000 passing yards in his first nine seasons and has completed 314 passes of 25+ yards since he entered the league in 2014, third-most in the NFL over that span.

Carr started all 17 games in 2023 and completed 375-of-548 passes [68.4 pct.] for 3,878 yards with 25 touchdowns, eight interceptions and a 97.7 passer rating. He finished his first season in Black and Gold ranked second in the NFL in fourth quarter passer rating [106.9], sixth in completion percentage, seventh in completions and tenth in TD passes and passer rating.

In 2024, Carr has completed 90-of-128 passes [70.3 pct.] for 989 yards, eight touchdowns, only four interceptions and a 100.7 passer rating. He has missed his first games as a Saint in Weeks Six-Eight [oblique], but is expected to return to practice this week in preparation for the Week Nine division contest at Carolina.

The first of the club’s three fifth round picks, Rattler was selected in the 2024 NFL Draft out of the University of South Carolina and has made his first three career starts in the absence of Carr (oblique), completing 59-of-99 passes for 571 yards (59.6 pct.) with one touchdown, while carrying nine times for 61 yards.

**RUNNING BACKS**

**ALVIN KAMARA**

A talented runner and receiver who was selected by the Saints in the third round of the 2017 NFL Draft out of Tennessee, Kamara enjoyed an outstanding rookie campaign. He ranked first on the club and sixth in the NFL in yards from scrimmage (1,554), second on the team in rushing and receiving, carrying 120 times for 728 yards (6.1 avg) with eight TDs and a two-point conversion, catching 81 passes for 826 yards (10.2 avg) with five touchdowns and one kickoff return for a touchdown. Kamara set a club rookie record with 14 total scores, tied for second in the NFL and finished first in the league in yards per carry. Kamara was the first Saints offensive rookie selected to the Pro Bowl since Rueben Mayes (1986), as an AP second team All-Pro (flex), the club’s first rookie All-Pro since 1993. He was also named *The Sporting News* NFL Rookie of the Year and AP NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year.

In 109 career regular season games with 78 starts, Kamara has carried 1,436 times for 6,334 yards (4.4 avg.) with 60 touchdowns and has caught 545 passes for 4,526 yards (8.3 avg.) with 24 touchdowns. Kamara is the franchise’s all-time leader in rushing touchdowns, total touchdowns (85), total yards from scrimmage (10,860) and all-purpose yardage (11,518) and is ranked second in rushing yards.

Kamara is off to a spectacular start in 2024, carrying 121 times for 505 yards (4.2 avg.) with six touchdowns and catching a club-best 40 passes for 307 yards (7.7 avg.) with a career-long 57-yard touchdown. With a nose for the end zone and the chains, he is ranked fourth in the league in first downs (41), third in total yards from scrimmage (812), tied for fourth in total touchdowns, fifth in rushing touchdowns and leads running backs in receiving.

**SCRIMMAGE LEADER**

Since entering the NFL in 2017, Kamara ranks second in the league in total yards from scrimmage (10,860), only one of four players to have 10,000 over that period. With 140 on Sunday, he would join Derrick Henry to become only the second since 2017 with 11,000. Kamara (2017-22) became the first NFL Player since Julio Jones (2014-19) to have six consecutive seasons of at least 1,300 total yards from scrimmage. The 10,860 total yards from scrimmage ranks second among active players.

Kamara in his first game returning from a knee injury in the December 12, 2021 30-9 win at the New York Jets rushed 27 times for 120 yards with one touchdown and caught 4 passes for 25 yards. **JAMAAL WILLIAMS**

This seven-year NFL veteran was signed by the New Orleans Saints as an unrestricted free agent in the 2023 offseason. In eight NFL seasons with Green Bay [2017-20], Detroit [2021-22] and New Orleans [2023-], Williams has played in 111 games with 44 starts, carrying 1,053 times for 4,082 yards with 32 touchdowns, also catching 182 passes for 1,282 yards with eight touchdowns for 5,353 total yards from scrimmage. Williams is part of a formidable rushing trio with Kamara and his former college teammate, Taysom Hill. In 2024, he has spelled Kamara at key times, rushing for 124 yards with one touchdown and catching four passes for 21 yards.

**KENDRE MILLER**

A third round draft pick of the Saints in 2023, Miller was a three-year standout at TCU, posting 2,410 rushing yards and 26 touchdowns in only 33 games with 17 starts. In 2022, the first-team All-Big 12 selection carried 242 times for 1,399 yards and 17 touchdowns.

Limited to eight games as a rookie due to injuries, when he carried 41 times for 156 yards, one touchdown and ten receptions for 117 yards, Miller has nine carries for 52 yards, two receptions and a 41-yard kickoff return in two games in 2024.

**OLAVE WIDE RECEIVERS**

The 11th overall pick in the 2022 NFL Draft out of Ohio State, this talented wideout made an immediate impact as a rookie, catching 72 passes for 1,042 yards [14.5 avg.] and four TDs, leading the team in receptions, receiving average and receiving yards, while earning September NFL Offensive Rookie of the Month honors as the 24th player since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger to record 1,000 receiving yards as a rookie. Olave became the third Saints rookie to reach 1,000 receiving yards and the first Saints rookie since WR Danny Abramowicz [1967] to lead the team in receiving, receiving yardage and yards per catch in his first campaign.

In 2023, Olave took the next step in his career, leading the team in receiving and receiving yardage for the second consecutive season with 87 receptions for 1,123 yards and five touchdowns, tying for the team lead. The Southern California native became the seventh Saint with 85 receptions in a season and the sixth with 1,100 receiving yards in a season. In 2024, he leads the wideout corps in receiving with 31 grabs for a club-best 387 yards with one touchdown in seven games.

#### **CEDRICK WILSON JR.**

This seventh-year wideout was signed by New Orleans to a two-year contract at the start of free agency to compete for snaps on offense and to provide veteran leadership to the wideout room. In 75 regular season games with seven starts, he has recorded 110 receptions for 1,357 yards with 12 touchdowns. In 2023, the Memphis native posted 22 catches for 296 yards with three touchdowns, adding three grabs for 37 yards in the postseason. Wilson has nine grabs for 88 yards with one touchdown in 2024, after recording six grabs for a game-high 57 yards with one score on Oct. 17, vs. Denver.

#### **BUB MEANS**

A fifth round pick of the Saints in 2024, Means played wideout for two seasons at Louisiana Tech and his final two at Pittsburgh, recording career totals of 90 receptions for 1,522 yards [17.2 avg.] with ten touchdowns. Earning Honorable Mention All-ACC in 2023, when he compiled 41 receptions for 721 yards [17.6 avg.] and six touchdowns. Means has seen an expanded role in the Saints wide receiver corps following injuries to the group, playing in seven games with one start and recording nine receptions for 118 yards [13.1 avg.] with one touchdown.

## TIGHT ENDS

## TAYSOM HILL

Hill has brought unheralded versatility to the Saints offense and special teams. A participant on special teams since midseason in 2017, as well as a signal-caller and as a runner and receiver, Hill has played in 101 regular season games with 45 starts at several positions. He has carried 416 times for 2,256 yards, the most by a Saint not to play running back, with 29 touchdowns, ranked fifth in club records. In the passing game, he has caught 80 passes for 779 yards with 11 touchdowns, completed 192-of-299 passes [64.2 pct.] for 2,351 yards with 11 touchdowns, returned 19 kickoffs for 447 yards, made one defensive tackle, one forced fumble, 15 special teams tackles and blocked one punt.

Despite missing four games this season with rib injuries, Hill showed his value immediately in his return to the lineup Sunday at the Los Angeles Chargers, when he dislodged the ball from the punter and forced a safety, in addition to carrying four times for 20 yards, catching two passes for 21 yards and completing a pass for three yards on a trick play.

## RENAISSANCE MAN

Hill turned in an all-around standout performance in the November 5, 2023 win over the Chicago Bears, where he led the team in rushing, carrying 11 times for 52 yards [4.7 avg.], completed a three-yard touchdown pass to tight end Juwan Johnson and caught four passes for 13 yards with one touchdown.

**47** - Hill brought back his first career NFL kickoff return 47 yards in a 21-18 win over the Cleveland Browns on Sept. 16, 2018, the longest of his career. In part-time kickoff return duty, he has brought back 19 kicks for 447 yards [23.5 avg.].

**575** - Hill's 575 rushing yards in 2022, was the highest rushing yardage total by a Saint whose primary position is not running back. In fact, Hill has the four biggest single-season non-running back rushing yardage totals.

**5,833** - Hill has accounted a total of 5,833 total yards in his eight-year NFL career [2,351 passing, 779 receiving, 2,256 rushing and 447 kickoff returns].

**JUWAN JOHNSON**

The former Penn State and Oregon wideout joined the New Orleans Saints in 2020 following the NFL Draft and transitioned to tight end his second season in 2021. In 2022, the New Jersey native had a breakout campaign as he appeared in 16 games with 12 starts and finished with 42 receptions for 508 yards and a team-best seven touchdown grabs. Johnson was tied for third among National Football League tight ends in receiving touchdowns. Overall, Johnson’s 15 touchdown grabs since 2021 lead the team.

In 13 games with 11 starts in 2023, Johnson finished with 37 receptions for 368 yards and four touchdowns to lead the position group in all major receiving categories. In his final four contests of the season, three of which were Saints victories, Johnson had 17 grabs for 206 yards and three touchdowns. In 2024, he has 18 grabs for 184 yards.

**BIG TARGET**

Johnson’s 12 touchdown grabs since 2022 are tied for fifth among NFL tight ends following his 16-yard scoring grab in the season opener.

**FOSTER MOREAU**

This veteran tight end and New Orleans native who was a standout at Jesuit High School and Louisiana State University signed with the Saints in the 2023 offseason. He finished his fifth National Football League season and first with the Black and Gold after spending his first four campaigns with the Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders, who originally selected him in the fourth round of the 2019 NFL Draft. In his career, Moreau has contributed both as a pass catcher and blocker, appearing in 84 regular season games with 52 starts and has recorded 123 receptions for 1,450 yards [11.8 avg.] with 15 touchdowns, also adding seven special teams tackles.

In his first season with the Saints, Moreau was selected as the club’s winner of the Ed Block Courage Award, recognizing his recovery and return to the field following an offseason diagnosis of Nodular Lymphocyte-Pedominant Hodgkins Lymphoma [NLPHL] at a free agency physical with the team. Moreau returned to the field following the NFL Draft and also battled a nagging ankle injury to play in 15 games with ten starts and recorded 21 receptions for 193 yards with one touchdown.

In 2024, Moreau leads the Saints tight ends in receiving touchdowns with two scoring grabs on 11 catches for 150 yards [13.6 avg.], starting all eight games. In a three-game stretch from Weeks Five-Seven, he caught six passes for 105 yards, including QB Derek Carr’s 150th touchdown pass as well as 41- and 32-yard gains from Spencer Rattler.

### CAMERON JORDAN

New Orleans' first choice in the 2011 NFL Draft [24th overall] out of the University of California, Jordan has played in 217 career regular season games with 216 starts, recording 785 tackles [482 solo], a franchise record 117.5 sacks for a loss of 779.5 yards, three interceptions, 65 pass breakups, 15 forced fumbles and 11 fumble recoveries. In 2023, despite a lingering ankle injury, Jordan started every contest and recorded 43 tackles [20 solo], two sacks, three pass breakups and one fumble recovery.

## MR. 200

On Dec. 24, 2022, at Cleveland, Jordan played in his 200th career game [regular season/postseason combined] in a Black and Gold uniform, moving him into third place on the club's all-time games played list. The following week at Philadelphia, Jan. 1, 2023, Jordan also started his 200th career game, joining Drew Brees as only the second player to open 200 contests in franchise history. On Sept. 24, 2023, at Green Bay, Jordan played in his 206th career game, passing Thomas Morstead for second all-time in club record books. On Oct. 29, 2023, Jordan became only the second Saints player, first defensive Saint and 57th NFL defensive lineman to play in 200 regular season contests. On Nov. 5, 2023 vs. Chicago, he became only the second Saint to start 200 career regular season contests. Jordan has played in 217 career regular season games and playing in his 218th game on Sunday, he will move into a tie for 22nd all-time among defensive linemen with Pro Football Hall of Famers Dwight Freeney and Alan Page and stalwart nose tackle Joe Nash.

**BRYAN BRESEE**

The team’s first round selection in the 2023 NFL Draft out of Clemson after being a three-time All-ACC selection, the Maryland native played in 26 games with 21 starts for the Tigers, producing 54 tackles [35 solo], 15 stops for loss, nine sacks, a forced fumble, an interception and five passes defended.

Bresee immediately found a role in New Orleans’ interior rotation and appeared in all 17 games, recording 24 tackles, 4.5 sacks and six pass breakups. His takedown total was the highest by a Saints rookie defensive tackle since becoming an official statistic in 1982 and his pass defense total was the most in club records for a rookie at the position since the statistic was officially recorded in 1980, Bresee also tied for second in the league among defensive tackles in 2023.

Bresee is enjoying a breakout sophomore campaign, starting all four games and tying for second in the NFL among defensive tackles with four sacks.

**CARL GRANDERSON**

Signed by New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Wyoming in 2019, Granderson posted 17.5 sacks in college and possesses the prototypical frame for an NFL pass rusher. Granderson has become a significant cog in the team’s defensive line rotation with 209 tackles, 26 sacks, two pass breakups, four forced fumbles and two recoveries.

Earning the starting right defensive end position in 2023, Granderson posted a career-high 78 tackles [44 solo], led the team with a career-best 8.5 sacks for a 55-yard loss, one pass defense, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery. Through five games in 2024, Granderson has 30 tackles, three sacks and one forced fumble.

**PAYTON TURNER**

With the 28th overall pick in the 2021 NFL Draft out of Houston, the Saints added to the defensive line with this gifted pass rusher. In 18 career games, Turner has recorded 29 tackles, three sacks, one pass breakup one fumble recovery, one special teams stop and one blocked field goal. In 2023, the Texan suffered a toe injury in the season-opening win over Tennessee that would sideline him for 15 contests. However, Turner returned for the season finale vs. Atlanta and recorded the first fumble recovery of his career, showing his promise both with his pass rush and playmaking abilities. Turner is a part of the team’s defensive line rotation in 2024 with five tackles, one sack, two passes defended and two special teams stops.

**LINEBACKERS**

**CHASE YOUNG**

Originally selected by Washington with the second overall pick in the 2020 NFL Draft out of Ohio State, this talented edge rusher is in his fifth season in the NFL and first with New Orleans. In five campaigns for Washington (2020-23), San Francisco (2023) and New Orleans (2024), Young has appeared in 51 regular season games with 32 starts and recorded 118 tackles (78 solo), 18.5 sacks, 24 stops for loss, ten pass breakups, six forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries. The consensus NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year, Young recorded 44 tackles, 7.5 sacks, ten stops for loss and made multiple splash plays with four forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries in 2020. Young played in only 12 games from 2021-22 after suffering a knee injury midway through his second campaign. In 2023, he played in seven games for Washington and nine for San Francisco following a midseason trade and tied his career-best with 7.5 takedowns in helping the 49ers advance to Super Bowl LVIII. Young has fit in with the New Orleans defensive line with 18 tackles, two sacks and one pass defense.

**NATHAN SHEPHERD**

Originally selected by the New York Jets in the third round of the 2018 NFL Draft out of Fort Hays State, this versatile defensive tackle enters his seventh NFL season, his second campaign with the Saints. The Ajax, Ontario, Canada native has appeared in 98 career games with 37 starts, totaling 18- tackles (95 solo) and nine sacks for a loss of 75 yards. In 2024, this valued free agent acquisition has started every game for New Orleans for the second consecutive season and has 19 tackles.

**KHALEN SAUNDERS**

Originally selected by the Kansas City Chiefs in the third round of the 2019 NFL Draft out of Western Illinois, Saunders enters his sixth NFL season and second campaign with New Orleans. Signed as an unrestricted free agent in the 2023 offseason, Saunders combined with two other newcomers in Shepherd and Bresee to form a new interior front, recording career-highs in tackles (57) and solo stops (24). In 59 career regular season games with 23 starts, Saunders has recorded 152 tackles (71 solo), 5.5 sacks, one interception, four pass breakups and five stops for loss.



**DEMARIO DAVIS**

This dependable and sure-tackling defender joined the New Orleans Saints in 2018 after spending his first six NFL seasons with the New York Jets and Cleveland Browns. In his career, the Brandon, Miss. native has appeared in 201 regular season games with 187 starts for the Jets (2012-15, 2017), Browns (2016) and the Saints (2018-), recording 1,386 stops (887 solo), 43.5 sacks, three interceptions, 56 pass breakups, four forced fumbles, eight fumble recoveries and 24 special teams tackles.

In 2023, Davis started every contest and again led the Black and Gold in tackles with 121 stops (74 solo), ranked second with 6.5 sacks and added one forced fumble, one fumble recovery and four pass breakups. He joined LB Joe Federspiel as only the second Saint to have 100 stops in six straight seasons, having done so in his last seven campaigns and his tenth season overall of his 12-year National Football League career.

**PETE WERNER**

New Orleans selected this three-year starter from Ohio State in the second round of the 2021 NFL Draft. The Indianapolis native finished his college career playing in 47 career games with 35 starts, recording 185 tackles [111 solo], 16 stops for loss, four sacks, 11 pass breakups, four forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Werner helped power the Buckeyes to the College Football Playoff championship game as a senior in 2020, when he was voted by the Big Ten coaches as a first-team All-Conference selection and a Butkus Award semi-finalist, posting 54 tackles, 2.5 stops for loss, one sack and two forced fumbles.

In four seasons, Werner has played in 47 games with 39 starts and has recorded 252 tackles [163 solo], a split sack, one interception, four pass breakups, two forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and three special teams stops.

Werner finished the 2023 season ranked second on the team with 93 stops, a split sack, one interception, one pass breakup and two fumble recoveries, tied for the team lead. In five games started/played in 2024, he has posted 30 tackles, recording nine on Sunda at the Chargers after missing three contests [hamstring].

**WILLIE GAY JR.**

A contributor on defense for the back-to-back Super Bowl Champion Kansas City Chiefs, this sideline to sideline linebacker joined the Saints at the start of the 2024 free agency period. In five seasons, Gay has played in 63 regular season games with 53 starts, posting 243 tackles [157 solo], six sacks, four interceptions, including one returned for a touchdown, 21 pass breakups, three forced fumbles, six fumble recoveries and seven special teams stops. In nine postseason games played/starts, Gay has accumulated 29 stops, a split sack and three passes defended.

In his final season in Kansas City, Gay played in 16 regular season games with 15 starts for the Chiefs and finished the season with 58 tackles [44 solo], one sack, one interception, four pass breakups, one forced fumble and a career-high three fumble recoveries. In three postseason starts en route to the Super Bowl Championship, Gay collected nine more stops and one pass defense. Despite missing one contest with a hand injury, Gay leads the Saints in 2024 with two fumble recoveries.

**ANFERNEE ORJI**

After originally signed as an undrafted free agent out of Vanderbilt in 2023, where he led the Commodores in tackles in each of his final three seasons, Orji spent his entire rookie season on the club's practice squad. He received the opportunity to see extensive snaps in practice in training camp due to injuries to teammates Davis and Werner. In three preseason contests, Orji led the team with 20 tackles [team-high 13 solo], one stop for loss, two passes defended and three special teams stops, securing a 53-man roster spot. He ranks second on the team with ten special teams tackles and has added 15 defensive stops.

**SECONDARY**

**S TYRANN MATHIEU**

This versatile, hard-hitting, playmaking safety and New Orleans native enters his third season with his hometown team, signing after the 2022 NFL Draft. Mathieu has brought experience and leadership to the Saints secondary. He was originally selected by the Arizona Cardinals in the third round (69th overall) in the 2013 NFL Draft out of LSU and has played for the Cardinals (2013-17), Houston Texans (2018), Kansas City Chiefs (2019-21) and Saints (2022-). In 11 NFL seasons, he has played in 171 regular season games with 162 starts and has posted career totals of 805 tackles (660 solo), 43 stops for loss, 11 sacks for a loss of 78 yards, 35 interceptions for 524 return yards, four brought back for touchdowns, 101 passes defended, six forced fumbles, eight fumble recoveries and five special teams stops. Mathieu has been selected to three Pro Bowls, three Associated Press All-Pro teams and the Pro Football Hall of Fame’s 2010’s All-Decade Team.

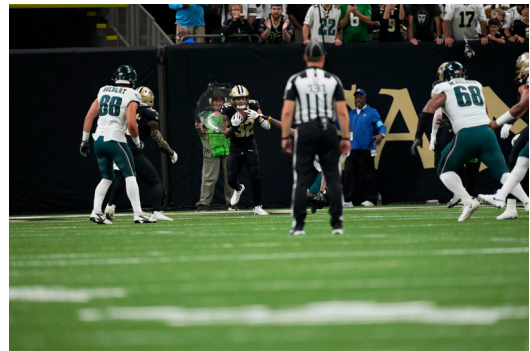
In his second season in New Orleans in 2023, Mathieu opened all 17 contests for the second consecutive campaign and finished with 75 tackles (50 solo), four interceptions, tied for seventh in the NFL and the team lead, returned for 122 yards with a TD and nine passes defended.

**THE ONLY ONE**

In 2024, Mathieu is his usual playmaking self. Through eight games, he has opened every contest at free safety and posted 33 tackles (26 solo), two interceptions, three pass breakups, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery. Mathieu is tied for tenth in the National Football League with two interceptions and is tied for first on the club with three total takeaways.

**FOUR IN A ROW**

Dating back to an interception in the 2023 season finale vs. Atlanta, recovering a fumble in the 2024 season opener vs. Carolina and picking off Dallas Cowboys quarterback Dak Prescott and Philadelphia Eagles signal-caller Jalen Hurts in Weeks Three and Four, Mathieu recorded a least one takeaway in four consecutive games for the first time in his career. Mathieu is the first Saints defender to record takeaways in four consecutive contests since safety Sammy Knight had at least one in five consecutive contests from Oct. 7-Nov. 4, 2001.



**NOSE FOR THE BALL**

Mathieu’s 35 interceptions since coming into the NFL in 2013 are first in the league over the period after tying for the club lead with four picks in 2023 and leading the team with two in 2024. Mathieu’s 35 career picks are tied for first among active players, with Vikings S Harrison Smith.

**CB MARSHON LATTIMORE**

Selected by the Saints in the first round (11th overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft Lattimore started all 13 games he appeared in. He totaled 53 tackles (44 solo), a forced fumble, one fumble recovery, five interceptions for 85 yards and 18 passes defensed. As a rookie, Lattimore became the youngest Saint (21 years old) ever selected to the Pro Bowl and was voted as the AP NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year.

In his eighth season, Lattimore has started all 97 regular season games he has played in, recording 405 tackles (326 solo), 15 interceptions, 88 passes defensed, five forced fumbles and five fumble recoveries, earning Pro Bowl honors in four seasons.

To open 2023, Lattimore came up with a standout performance in the opening win over Tennessee. In addition to his 15th career pick, to move him into a tie for eighth place in club record books in interceptions, he also finished with four passes defensed, the third time in his career he has deflected at least four throws in a contest. In a season cut short by an ankle injury, he started the first ten games and posted 48 stops, one pick and eight passes defensed. In 2024, he has opened seven games and recorded 30 tackles and one pass defense, assigned to covering the top receiver of opponents.

**ALONTAE TAYLOR**

Selected by the Saints in the second round (49th overall) of the 2022 NFL Draft out of Tennessee, Taylor shook off early injuries to play in 13 games with nine starts and posted 45 tackles (38 solo) and a club-best 11 pass breakups, ranked fourth among NFL rookies.

Moving to the nickel position in 2023, possessing extensive experience on the inside and the outside, Taylor appeared in all 17 games with 13 starts and recorded 75 tackles, his first two career interceptions and a career-high 14 pass breakups, tied for second on the team and ninth in the NFL.

In 2024, Taylor has played in all eight games with six starts and ranks third on the team with 44 tackles (32 solo), is tied for first with four sacks and has added seven passes defensed and a team-best two forced fumbles. His four sacks are tied for the most by a Saints cornerback with Alex Molden. His pass defense total is tied for tenth in the NFL, while Taylor's seven stops for loss are tied for ninth in the league.

**DB DROP**

Taylor became the first Saints defensive back to record three sacks in a contest since the statistic was officially recognized by the NFL in 1982. The only other defensive back to record three sacks on kickoff weekend is former Chargers S Rodney Harrison (vs. Buffalo, 9/6/98). After splitting a sack on Sunday at the Los Angeles Chargers, Taylor's four sacks are tied for the highest total by a cornerback in Saints record books with Alex Molden's four in 1997, while the total leads all defensive backs.
