TODAY'S MATCHUP

After wrapping up the 2020 regular season Sunday with a 33-7 win over the Carolina Panthers at Bank of America Stadium., the New Orleans Saints (12-4) host the Chicago Bears (8-8) in an NFC Wild Card Playoff matchup, squaring off with a spot in the NFC Divisional Round on the line.

The game will mark the third time that the Saints and Bears will meet in the playoffs, the first two a 1990 Chicago Wild Card win and a 2006 Bears NFC Championship victory, both at Soldier Field. The Saints lead the regular season series 17-13 and captured the first 2020 meeting between the clubs, a 26-23 win on November 1 at Soldier Field.

The Saints enter the playoffs coming off one of their best regular seasons. In capturing their fourth consecutive

NFC South division title, becoming only the third team in the conference since 2002 realignment to win four straight division titles. With Sunday's win over Carolina, the 2020 Saints became the first NFC South team since the division's establishment to finish 6-0 in division play.

New Orleans enters the postseason well-positioned as a balanced team with the ability to run the ball and stop the run. The Black and Gold finished ranked sixth in the National Football League in rushing (141.6 ypg.) and finished with a franchise-record 30 rushing touchdowns, tied for the sixth-highest total in league history. Defensively, New Orleans finished fourth in the league in opponent net yards per game (310.9), fourth against the run and fifth against the pass. Scoring 30.1 points, per game, the Saints ranked fifth in the league, only surrendering 21.0 points per game, also tied for fifth. Five Saints were selected to the Pro Bowl.

SAINTS-BEARS CONNECTIONS

New Orleans Head Coach **Sean Payton** is a Naperville, Illinois native and played QB at Naperville Central High School. He earned a communications degree from Eastern Illinois, posting 10,665 passing yards as a three-time *Associated Press* All-American. Payton played in the Arena Football League with the Chicago Bruisers and briefly with the Bears in 1987. He was inducted into the Eastern Illinois Hall of Fame and has his number retired. He also tutored quarterbacks for a year at the University of Illinois Payton has a sister and niece who live in Skokie...Chicago TE **Jimmy Graham** was a third round draft pick of New Orleans in 2010 and played five seasons for the team, ranking fifth in club record books in receiving, most at his position with 386 receptions for 5,512 yards and 32 touchdowns...Chicago General Manager **Ryan Pace** served in several capacities in the New Orleans front office before being tabbed to lead the Bears football operation in 2015, most recently as Director of Player Personnel from 2013-15. Bears Director of Football Administration **Joey Laine**, Director of Player Personnel **Josh Lucas** and Director of College Scouting **Mark Sadowski** all worked in the New Orleans front office...Saints Senior Offensive Assistant/Wide Receivers **Curtis Johnson** served as wide receivers coach in Chicago in 2016. Johnson and Bears Defensive Coordinator **Chuck Pagano** served on the same University of Miami staff from 1996-2000...New Orleans Pass Rush Specialist **Brian Young** and Assistant Head Coach/Tight Ends **Dan Campbell** played with Chicago Wide Receivers Coach **Mike Furrey** in St. Louis and Detroit respectively...Saints Senior Defensive Assistant **Peter Giunta** and Chicago Tight Ends Coach **Kevin M. Gilbride** served on the same New York Giants staff from 2010-14...Bears DT **Akiem Hicks** was a third round draft pick of the Saints in 2012 and played for the club from 2012-15...New Orleans Defensive Assistant **Michael Hodges** served on the coaching staff at Eastern Illinois from 2014-16, coaching linebackers from 2014-15 and serving as co-defensive coordinator his final season in Charleston...New Orleans Assistant Offensive Line Coach **Brendan Nugent** served on the Bears coaching staff from 2013-14...New Orleans radio play-by-play voice **Zach Strief** played at Northwestern from 2002-05...Saints Offensive Line Coach **Dan Roushar** was a two-year letterman at quarterback at Northern Illinois and later had two stints on their coaching staff in 1984 and from 1997-2002...Saints DB **Justin Hardee** played at Illinois...New Orleans WR **Austin Carr** played at Northwestern...Bears WR **Ted Ginn Jr.** played for New Orleans from 2017-19 and his father, **Ted Ginn Sr.** coached Hardee and Saints CB **Marshon Lattimore** at Glenville High School in Cleveland...New Orleans Combine Scout **Matt Phillips** is the son of Chicago President & CEO **Matt Phillips**...Bears Offensive Line Coach **Juan Castillo** served on the same

coaching staff in Philadelphia with Payton from 1997-98...Saints Secondary Coach **Aaron Glenn** and Bears Special Teams Coordinator **Chris Tabor** served on the same staff in Cleveland from 2014-15...Chicago DL **Mario Edwards Jr.** played for New Orleans in 2019...New Orleans Assistant General Manager/College Scouting Director **Jeff Ireland** is the grandson of former longtime Bears personnel executive **Jim Pamer**...New Orleans Defensive Coordinator **Dennis Allen** and Bears Defensive Line Coach **Jay Rodgers** served on the same Denver staff in 2011. Brees and Rodgers, who made his coaching debut as a graduate assistant at LSU from 2001-02, were high school teammates at Austin (Texas) Westlake HS. Brees and Bears QB **Nick Foles** both prepped at Austin Westlake as they and Peyton and Eli Manning (Newman HS) are the only two duos of Super Bowl winning quarterbacks hailing from the same high school. Foles also played with CB **Patrick Robinson** and S **Malcolm Jenkins** in Philadelphia where they were Super Bowl winning teammates. Saints RB **Latavius Murray** and Bears OLB **Khalil Mack** were teammates in Oakland from 2004-16, where Allen served as Mack's head coach for the start of his NFL career...Bears T **Bobby Massie** played at the University of Mississippi...New Orleans QB **Jameis Winston** played with Chicago K **Cairo Santos** in Tampa Bay in 2019. Santos is a former Tulane standout...Chicago LB **Barkevious Mingo** prepped at West Monroe HS and played for Cleveland with Saints LB **Craig Robertson** from 2013-15...Saints WR **Eric Kumerow** prepped at South Elgin (Ill.) HS and started his college career at Illinois.

THE COACHES

Saints Head Coach **Sean Payton** has posted a 151-88 overall record (.632), including an 8-7 postseason mark after the franchise had won only one playoff game prior to his arrival in 2006. Payton holds both the club's top victory total and winning percentage. Payton is ranked 25th all-time in NFL record books in victories, fifth among active head coaches. He continues to represent the Saints as the model of stability not only within the NFC South, as he is the longest tenured head coach within the division, but also among the most accomplished within the NFL. Only the Patriots' Bill Belichick (2000) has been with the his team longer than Payton's 15 seasons. Payton is also one of just nine active NFL head coaches to lead a team to a Super Bowl victory. The others are Belichick, the Seattle Seahawks' Pete Carroll, the Las Vegas Raiders' Jon Gruden (Buccaneers in 2002), the Baltimore Ravens' John Harbaugh, the Dallas Cowboys' Mike McCarthy (Green Bay Packers in 2010), the Philadelphia Eagles' Doug Pederson, Kansas City's Andy Reid and the Pittsburgh Steelers' Mike Tomlin. The 2020 Saints are only the sixth team in National Football League history to have six-game winning streaks in four consecutive seasons and with a nine-game winning streak had won at least nine straight games in two of the past three seasons and have had double-digit victory figures and consecutive playoff berths in four straight years for the first time in franchise history, also being only the third NFC team since divisional alignment to capture four straight division championships. Five Saints were selected to the Pro Bowl as the Black and Gold will enter the NFL playoffs for the ninth season in Payton's head coaching tenure. The 2019 New Orleans Saints posted their second consecutive 13-3 record, capturing their third consecutive NFC South title and playoff berth. A franchise-record six players were selected *Associated Press* All-Pro and a club-best 11 were named to the Pro Bowl. New Orleans won seven games on the road for the second consecutive season. The Saints set an National Football League single-season record with only eight turnovers as they ranked second in the league in turnover ratio (+15). New Orleans also ranked third in sacks (51), tied for third in scoring (28.6 ppg.) and ranked fourth in opponent rushing yards per game. Special teams captured first place in National Football League writer Rick Gosselin's annual comprehensive rankings. Payton earned a bachelor's degree in communications at Eastern Illinois, where as a quarterback he had 10,665 passing yards, at the time the third-highest total in NCAA Division I-AA history. Payton was inducted into the Eastern Illinois Hall of Fame in 2000 and had his jersey retired in a ceremony in 2010. He received an honorary doctorate from his alma mater in 2013. Payton was born Dec. 29, 1963 in San Mateo, Calif., and raised in Naperville, Ill., Payton has a daughter, Meghan and a son,

Connor.

Chicago Head Coach **Matt Nagy** is in his third season at the helm for the Bears after being hired on January 8, 2018 as the 16th head coach in club history. Nagy guided the Bears to their first playoff appearance since 2010 in his first season in 2018 and brought Chicago back to the playoffs in 2020, his third campaign. He joined the Bears with 10 seasons of coaching experience in the National Football League with the Kansas City Chiefs (2013-17) and Philadelphia Eagles (2008-12). Nagy was promoted to offensive coordinator in Kansas City in 2017 after spending 2016 as co-offensive coordinator with Brad Childress. He served as quarterbacks coach his first three seasons in Kansas City. In Philadelphia, Nagy served as the Eagles' quality control coach (2011-12) and was a coaching assistant (2010), after getting his start as a coaching intern with the Eagles (2008-2009). A standout quarterback at Delaware, Nagy was a quarterback in the Arena Football League for the New York Dragons (2002), Carolina Cobras (2004), Georgia Force (2005-06) and Columbus Destroyers (2007-08). He began coaching at the high school level, as an assistant at Manheim Central (2001), quarterbacks coach at Cedar Crest (2002-03) and offensive coordinator at Palmyra Area High School (2008-09). Born April 24, 1978 in Plainfield, New Jersey, he and his wife Stacey have four sons: Brayden, Tate, Jaxon and Jett.

SERIES HISTORY

New Orleans leads the Saints-Bears regular season series 17-13, one of ten clubs they have a winning record against. The Saints have dropped both playoff contests against Chicago, both of them played at Soldier Field. They will also be looking to extend the overall series win streak to seven games. New Orleans has taken the last six meetings, including a 26-23 overtime win on November 1, 2020 at Soldier Field. Of the 30 regular season contests in the all-time series, 15 have been decided by eight points or less, including seven of the last ten matchups. New Orleans has posted a 6-2 record against the Bears in contests played at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome:

WHAT TO LOOK FOR

- If the Saints defeat the Bears, they would move on to the NFC Divisional Playoff to be played at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome on a date to be announced later in the evening on either January 16 or 17.
- A Saints win would improve their overall postseason record to 10-12 and their home postseason mark to 8-5/
- A Saints win would improve New Orleans' postseason record against the Bears to 1-2, making Chicago the eighth team the eighth team they would have a postseason win against, and their overall record to 18-15. A win would improve New Orleans' record in the Mercedes-Benz Superdome (regular season and postseason) against them to 8-3, 3-0 since Sean Payton became head coach.
- A Saints win would improve Payton's postseason record to 9-7, home mark to 7-2.
- A Saints win over the Bears would make Chicago the fourth team, they would have two wins against in the 2020 season (regular season and postseason) following their NFC South sweep, joining Atlanta, Carolina and Tampa Bay. The only seasons that the Saints had multiple wins against three opponents (regular season and postseason) were 2000, 2006 and 2011, never having multiple victories against four.
 - A Saints win on Sunday by Payton would make Bears Head Coach Matt Nagy the ninth coach for him to have a victory against in the postseason, giving him a winning mark against nine of the 14 head coaches he has faced off against in the postseason.
- A Saints win on Sunday would give the Saints a 5-6 record in the Wild Card round, 4-3 at home and give Payton a 4-2 mark in the Wild Card round, 3-1 at home.
- A Saints win on Sunday by Payton would give him nine postseason wins, tying him for 19th all-time in NFL record books with Vince Lombardi, Jimmy Johnson, John Madden and Tony Dungy.
- Quarterback **Drew Brees** has 434 career completions in the postseason, ranked fifth all-time in NFL postseason records, needing 27 to move into fourth past Joe Montana.
- Brees and wide receiver **Michael Thomas** have connected three times in the postseason for touchdowns, putting the wideout tied for fourth in club record books with Jimmy Graham, who will be playing for Chicago today. With one scoring grab he would move into a tie for first with Marques Colston, Devery Henderson and Willie Jackson and with two would become the club's all-time leader. His total touchdown total is tied for sixth with running back **Alvin Kamara**. With one touchdown by either Thomas or Kamara, one of them would move into a tie for second and with two, he would move into a tie with Reggie Bush for first all-time in postseason touchdowns. Thomas' 38 grabs are ranked second. With two, he would join Marques Colston (58) as only the second Saint with 40 postseason grabs. Thomas' 493 receiving yards and total yards from scrimmage rank second behind Colston's 788. With seven yards, he would join Colston as only the second Saint with 500 in both categories. Thomas has two 100-yard receiving games in the postseason. With 100 yards receiving today, he would tie Colston for the most 100-yard receiving games in club record books.
 - Defensive End **Cameron Jordan** has 5.5 postseason sacks, ranked first in club record books. With a takedown on Sunday of Bears signal-caller **Mitchell Trubisky**, he would be the sixth signal-caller to drop in the postseason.
 - Running back **Alvin Kamara** has 173 rushing yards in the postseason, ranked fourth in club record books. With 28 yards, he would surpass Reggie Bush and move into third, with 43, he would surpass Pierre Thomas and move into second and with 105, he would surpass Mark Ingram and move into first.. Kamara's two rushing touchdowns in the postseason are tied for first with three other Saints, needing one to become the club's postseason leader. Kamara has 28 postseason receptions, tied for fourth in club record books with Darren Sproles and first among Saints running backs. With his first grab Sunday, he would become the club's recordholder in catches among running backs and take over fourth overall. With four grabs, he would surpass wide receiver Devery Henderson to move in third in club record books. Kamara's 237 postseason receiving yards ranked eighth in club record books. With 31, he would surpass WR Willie Jackson to move into seventh. With 50, he would surpass running back Reggie Bush to move into sixth and also become the leader in receiving yards among running backs. With 57 yards, he would surpass wide receiver Robert Meachem and move into fifth. With 71, he would surpass wide receiver Ted Ginn Jr. and move into fourth. Kamara's 410 postseason yards from scrimmage are fifth in club history, needing 52 to surpass Henderson to move into fourth and 77 to surpass Bush and move into third, first among Saints running backs.
 - Cornerback **Marshon Lattimore** has two interceptions in the postseason. With his next interception, he would move into a tie for first with Jabari Greer for the club's postseason lead in picks.
 - Kicker **Wil Lutz** has 13 extra points in the postseason, second in club record books behind kicker Garrett Hartley, needing three to surpass Hartley.
