

THE OVERVIEW

The Jacksonville Jaguars (2-3) host the New Orleans Saints (4-1) at TIAA Bank Field in Week 6 on Sunday, Oct. 13 at 1 p.m. EDT. The Jaguars are seeking consecutive home victories after defeating the Titans, 20-7, in Week 3 on Thursday Night Football.

The Jaguars will commemorate Homecoming Weekend starting Friday night at the Episcopal School of Jacksonville varsity football game where both teams will receive commemorative 25th season footballs, and continuing through Sunday's game against the Saints. On Saturday, the Fantennial celebration kicks off with the "For the Love of Football Fan Fest" at Daily's Place, a free-to-attend family festival featuring an autograph signing by Jaguars Legends and three Pop Warner football games. On Sunday, more than 80 Jaguars alumni will be recognized during pregame ceremonies and, at halftime, the team will introduce the Jaguars All-25. Jacksonville will wear teal jerseys and white pants on Sunday, an homage to the inaugural season's traditional combination in 1995. In the team's 25-season history, the Jaguars have a 63-46 record in games in which they wear teal jerseys.

MINSHEW MANIA

In Week 5, QB **Gardner Minshew II** completed 26 of 44 passes (59.1 comp. pct.) for a Jaguars rookie-record 374 yards and two TDs for a passer rating of 101.9, becoming the first player in NFL history to throw for at least 200 passing yards with a passer rating of at least 95.0 in each of his first five career games. Through five career games, Minshew has completed 110 of 165 passes (66.7 comp. pct.) for 1,279 yards, nine TDs and one INT for a passer rating of 105.6. Minshew joins Kansas City QB **Patrick Mahomes** as the only players in NFL history to throw for at least 1,200 passing yards and nine TDs with one-or-fewer INTs through five career games.

AFC LEADERS

Second-year WR **DJ Chark Jr.** posted eight catches for 164 yards (20.5 rec. avg.) and two TDs in Week 5 at Carolina, all of which were careerhighs. Chark has now caught five TD passes this season, tied for the second-most through the team's first five games in franchise history. Chark joined former WR **Jimmy Smith** (Sept. 10, 2000) as the only players to register at least 160 receiving yards and two-plus receiving TDs in a single game in franchise history. In 2019, Chark has 27 receptions for 485 yards (18.0 rec. avg.) and five TDs and leads the AFC in receiving yards, receiving TDs and yards per catch (min. 20 receptions). Chark also joins Smith (536 receiving yards and six TD receptions in 2000) as the only players in franchise history to post at least 485 receiving yards and five receiving the team's first five games of a season. Smith was selected to the Pro Bowl following the 2000 season.

In Week 5, third-year RB **Leonard Fournette** rushed 23 times for 108 yards (4.7 rush avg.) and one TD, and also caught four passes for 29 yards. After rushing for a career-high 225 yards in Week 4 at Denver, Fournette has now posted consecutive games with 100-plus rushing yards for the first time since Weeks 5-6 of his rookie season in 2017. Fournette leads the AFC with 512 rushing yards on 95 carries (5.4 rushing avg.) entering Week 6. Fournette totaled 137 scrimmage yards in last Sunday's game and has totaled at least 85 scrimmage yards in five consecutive games, the longest active streak in the NFL. Week 5 marked Fournette's 12th career game totaling at least 100 scrimmage yards, the most through 26 career games in franchise history.

WEEK 6 QUICK HITS

• Head Coach **Doug Marrone** served as the offensive coordinator for New Orleans from 2006-08. During Marrone's tenure with the Saints, New Orleans ranked first in total yards per game (387.8), first in passing yards per game (294.1) and third in points per game (26.1).

• The Jaguars' leading rusher (Fournette, 24 years old), receiver (Chark, 23) and passer (Minshew, 23) are all 24 years old or younger, tied for the third-youngest skill position trio in the league. Fournette is the leading rusher in the AFC (512 rushing yards), Chark is the leading receiver in the AFC (485 receiving yards) and Minshew was awarded Offensive Rookie of the Month in September. All three players hail from the team's last three draft classes.

2.17 According to NextGen Stats, DE **Yannick Ngakoue** recorded a sack in 2.17 seconds in Week 5 at Carolina, posting the fastest sack of the 2019 season. Ngakoue, who totaled 2.0 sacks against the Panthers, stripped QB **Kyle Allen** on the play, marking the 11th forced fumble of his career.

WR **DJ Chark Jr.** has registered a league-leading seven receptions of at least 30 yards. Chark's 485 receiving yards are the fifth-most in the NFL, while his five receiving TDs are tied for the secondmost in the league. He's one of three players since 1998 (WR **Lee Evans**, 2008 and WR **Randy Moss**, 1998) to total at least seven catches of 30-plus yards through the first five weeks of the season.

The 2019 season marks the Jaguars' 25th as an NFL franchise. This weekend marks Homecoming Weekend for the Jaguars, when they'll celebrate the 25th season in franchise history with more than 80 alumni players expected in attendance, as well as Jacksonville's NFL 100 Fantennial.

In Week 5 game at Carolina, DE **Yannick Ngakoue** became the third player in Jaguars history to total 30.0 career sacks, joining DE **Tony Brackens** (55.0) and DE **Joel Smeenege** (34.0). Ngakoue's 31.5 sacks are the most by a Jaguars player through their first 52 games.

P **Logan Cooke** has totaled a 45.2 net punting average this season, the second-highest mark in the NFL. Cooke has registered a career 42.1 net punting average of 42.1 during his two-year career, the highest in franchise history.

Since Head Coach **Doug Marrone** was named the Jaguars head coach in 2017, Jacksonville has won 12 of 17 challenges (70.6 pct. win rate), the highest win rate in the NFL during that span. In Week 5, the Jaguars challenged an incomplete pass ruling, and the call was reversed for a 31-yard completion to WR **DJ Chark Jr.** RB **Leonard Fournette** scored on the next play.

Since signing with the Jaguars on Oct. 17, 2017, K **Josh Lambo** has converted 94.3 percent of his FGs (50 of 53), the highest mark in the NFL during that span among kickers with at least 10 attempts. Lambo has connected on all 12 of his attempts this season and has made 14 consecutive FGs entering Week 6.

Jaguars QB **Gardner Minshew II** recorded 374 passing yards and two TDs for a 101.9 passer rating in Jacksonville's Week 5 game at Carolina. Minshew (101.4) joined Panthers QB **Kyle Allen** and Los Angeles Rams QB **Jeff Kemp** (1984) as the only players in the Super Bowl era to have a passer rating of at least 100 with no interceptions in their first four career starts (minimum 20 attempts).

389

Of RB **Leonard Fournette's** 512 rushing yards this season, 389 have come in the second half. Fournette's 389 second-half rushing yards are the most in the NFL and the third-most by a player through the first five weeks of a season since the stat began being tracked in 1991.



THE SILVER SEASON

First Coast fans let the world know emphatically that it was time for Jaguars football when Jacksonville defied the odds on Nov. 30, 1993 and was awarded an NFL franchise in an announcement by NFL Commissioner **Paul Tagliabue**. Now, 25 seasons after its debut in 1995, the team has rolled out a season-long celebration a quarter century in the making.



"This season represents a historic moment for not just our team, but the entire First Coast community," said Jaguars President **Mark Lamping**. "We'll celebrate the legends of the past, the players of the future and the fans that have stood by our side through it all. The 2019 season will set the stage for the next 25 years of Jaguars football in Jacksonville."

The team has developed a host of new content series for its digital platforms, including "Perspectives," a podcast hosted by Jaguars.com Senior Correspondent **Brian Sexton**. Each week, he'll interview guests who were instrumental in crafting the early identity of the Jaguars, including **Mark Brunell, Tony Boselli** and Jaguars Executive Vice President of Football Operations **Tom Coughlin**.

Members of the Jaguars Legends community will be honored at each home game as part of the Jaguars All-25 recognition, and all Jaguars alumni will be welcomed back for Homecoming on Oct. 13.

THE LOGO

The Jaguars' 25th season commemorative logo was introduced by Owner **Shad Khan** at the team's annual State of the Franchise in April. It will be featured in each end zone at TIAA Bank Field this season and as a jersey patch alongside the NFL 100 emblem. The commemorative logo integrates four distinct elements designed to celebrate the team and its relationship with the Jacksonville community.

The Shield: The celebratory mark is anchored by a shield encasing the Jaguars mark, the City of Jacksonville skyline and the stylized number 25. The shield is also a nod to Jacksonville's deep military tradition and the Jaguars' longstanding support of both active duty and veteran personnel. It represents the strength and resiliency of this franchise, which continues to push forward in its pursuit of becoming a championship football team.



25: The number 25 rises above the City of Jacksonville skyline,

symbolizing the dawn of the next era of Jaguars football. It is displayed prominently in the team's proprietary font, Jaguars Newer Bold, which is a modern twist on classic block letters. It represents the convergence of the Jaguars' respect for tradition and progress that drives the team to push the boundaries of innovation, both on and off the field.

The Skyline: More than 25 years ago, the Jaguars were born thanks to the passion of the hardworking citizens of this community who willed the franchise into existence. The iconic skyline celebrates DUUUVAL and the fans who inspire and motivate our team on a daily basis.

Teal: The sky full of teal represents game day in Jacksonville when the city is awash in painted faces, rally towels and car flags as fans make their way to TIAA Bank Field. A mixture of blue sky and ocean waves, teal is the unique signature color of the Jaguars and a key part of team's uniforms since the inaugural season.


FROM THE MEDIA GUIDE ARCHIVES WEEK 5: Jaguars 41, Saints 23 DATE: November 21, 1999 SITE: Alltel Stadium

The Jaguars improved to 9-1 with a Sunday night victory over the New Orleans Saints for their seventh straight win. The Jacksonville offense totaled 494 yards, led by QB **Mark Brunell's** 351 passing yards and WR **Jimmy Smith's** 220 receiving yards on nine catches. The Jaguars forced the Saints to punt on the first possession of the game, and WR **Reggie Barlow** returned the kick 74 yards for a TD. It was the second punt return for a TD in his career and the second longest in team history. The Saints responded with a 1-yard scoring run by QB **Billy Joe Tolliver** – the first rushing TD scored by a Jaguars' opponent. Following a Brunell TD pass to TE **Damon Jones**, RB **Ricky Williams** scored his first NFL TD, tying the game 14-14. The Saints took the lead on a 52-yard field goal, then K **Mike Hollis** matched it with a 45-yarder as the half ended. The second half was all Jaguars, as they scored TDs on their first two possessions. Hollis added a 32-yard field goal for a 34-17 lead, then CB **Fernando Bryant** intercepted QB **Billy Joe Hobert** and the Jaguars converted the turnover into a 1-yard touchdown run by RB **James Stewart**. The defense allowed its most points (23), most TD (3) and most yards (339) of the season to date.

GAME NOTES

WR Jimmy Smith's 220 yards on nine catches were a career high, surprassing his previous best of 164 (9/22/97 vs. Pittsburgh). It maked the second-best receiving performance in the NFL in 1999. With two TDs, RB James Stewart scored nine rushing TDs on the season, a

With two TDs, RB **James Stewart** scored nine rushing TDs on the season, a career high. His 140 combined yards were the second most of his career. The Jaguars' big plays returned, with four plays of 30-plus yards, the most since October 12, 1998.

NO.1 - LT TONY BOSELLI


Former Jaguars LT Tony Boselli was selected No. 1 on the Jaguars All-25 presented by Sharpie.

"Just being included in the Jaguars All-25 is a huge honor and being named the number one player is amazing and very humbling considering all the great players who have played for the Jaguars," Boselli said. "When I was picked by the Jaguars in 1995 I could not have imagined what a big part of my life this franchise and the City of Jacksonville would become. I want to thank the entire Jaguars organization, the amazing Jaguars fans and the all the media that covered my entire career. It's great to be a Jaguar!"

Boselli, 6-7, 324, was the second overall pick in the 1995 NFL Draft and the first-ever draft selection by the Jaguars. Boselli, a five-time Pro Bowl selection (1996-2000) and three-time All-Pro (1997-99), started 90 of 91 career games from 1995-2001. During his seven seasons in the NFL, Boselli allowed only 15.5 sacks, and was the first Jaguars players to be inducted into the team's "Pride of the Jaguars." Boselli's dominance was recognized when he was named to the NFL's All-Decade team of the 1990s. For the last three seasons, Boselli has been a finalist for the Pro Football Hall of Fame. He is the first Jaguars player in franchise history to be named a finalist for the Pro Football Hall of Fame.

"For him to not only live up to his draft status but live beyond the draft status; to be a generational left tackle to be as good as he was; when he gets in the Hall of Fame, and he will get in the Hall of Fame, it will be the most remarkable story along those lines maybe in NFL history," said **John Oehser**, Jaguars.com senior writer and a Jaguars All-25 voter. "Not only did he become the face of the franchise while he was playing, he remains an icon in Jacksonville. It's hard to imagine a better first pick in draft than Tony Boselli was for the Jaguars."

Currently, Boselli lives in Ponte Vedra with his wife, Angi. The couple has five children: Andrew, Adam, Ashli, Alexis and Ansli. Boselli serves as a Jaguars radio analyst on the team's play-by-play team on 1010XL, as well as an NFL analyst for Westwood One. Boselli has been a part of multiple business endeavors, including being the founding partner of Healthy Schools, LLC. Boselli also served as the offensive line coach at the Episcopal School of Jacksonville, working for former teammate and the team's head coach, Mark Brunell. He and his wife Angi also founded the Boselli Foundation during his rookie year in 1995 and the organization is still very active in the Jacksonville esteem and to succeed at home, at school and at play.

JAGUARS SURPRISE LOCAL HIGH SCHOOL WITH LOCKER ROOM RENOVATION

On Tuesday, Sept. 24, the Jacksonville Jaguars continued their season-long celebration of their historic 25th season as well as the 100th anniversary of the National Football League with a special surprise for Englewood High School. Following a surprise introduction by former Jaguars CB and Englewood High School alumnus **Rashean Mathis**, the varsity football team was given a first look at the more than \$100,000 renovation to their locker room. The entire football program, both varsity and junior varsity, was also invited to attend the Jaguars versus Saints game on Oct. 13 at TIAA Bank Field and stand on the sidelines for pregame festivities.

"This celebration of our 25th season and the NFL's 100th anniversary is a historic milestone for the entire community," said Jaguars President **Mark Lamping**. "Beyond the touchdowns and fan festivals, we wanted to leave a legacy for the next generation of Jaguars fans and players."

The existing locker room was given a top to bottom makeover, including the installation of air conditioning, electrical outlets, rubber flooring, carpet and bathroom tile. Old plumbing and walls were torn down to make way for a new equipment room, which was filled with items including shoulder pads, gloves and compression shorts. The space was designed to emphasize the Rams' mascot and color scheme with all new paint, acrylic letter signage and vinyl graphics. A new speaker system was installed to allow for music on game day and the coaching offices were outfitted with new desks, chairs and tables. Every Englewood football player, varsity and junior varsity, received a personalized Jaguars football and T-shirt in addition to personal hygiene products.

"When the Jaguars called me with an idea to partner with Englewood High School to celebrate the 25th season, I immediately said, 'Whatever you need me to do, I'm in." said Mathis. "I walked these halls, sat in this locker room and grew up in this diverse neighborhood where families sacrifice every day to give their kids the opportunity to succeed. I'm grateful to the Jaguars and all the community partners for giving these student-athletes this incredible experience. Today we're going to change a life. I guarantee it."

The renovations were funded with \$50,000 from the Jaguars Foundation and more than \$80,000 in donated labor, building materials and new football equipment from multiple community partners.

The Jaguars are adopting Englewood High School for the duration of the 25th season. The partnership kicked off in August with a sponsored meal for all fall sport athletes courtesy of Dick's Wings. Throughout the remainder of the season, the Jaguars will engage with students through cheerleading clinics, financial aid guidance, career counseling and other football celebrations.

DOUG MARRONE HEAD COACH JOINED JAGUARS: 2015 COLLEGE: SYRACUSE

Doug Marrone was named the fifth head coach of the Jaguars on Jan. 9, 2017 after previously serving as the team's interim head coach for the final two games of the 2016 season. Marrone was originally hired as the team's assistant head coach-offense/offensive line coach on Jan. 20, 2015, following a two-year stint as the head coach for the Buffalo Bills (2013-14).

Marrone has compiled a 18-21 record as Jacksonville's head coach. In 2018, the Jaguars finished with a 5-11 record, including a 3-4 mark at TIAA Bank Field. Jacksonville began the season with a 3-1 start, but finished fourth in the division standings. The Jaguars had two players selected to the 2019 Pro Bowl: CB **Jalen Ramsey**, making his second consecutive appearance as a Pro Bowl starter, and DL **Calais Campbell**, making his second consecutive and fourth overall Pro Bowl appearance.

In his first full season as the team's head coach, Marrone finished the 2017 regular season with a 10-6 record, which was tied for the league's biggest win/ loss improvement (+7) among first-year head coaches (tied with the Rams' **Sean McVay**). Marrone led the team to an AFC South division title, which was the team's first division title since winning the AFC Central in 1999. The Jaguars finished the 2017 season with the top-ranked rushing offense (141.4 yards per game) and the league's best pass defense (169.0 passing yards allowed per game) en route to their first playoff berth in a decade. Under Marrone's tutelage, the Jaguars hosted a playoff game for the first time in 18 years, defeating the Buffalo Bills, 10-3, in the AFC Wild Card. The team advanced to the AFC Championship game for the first time since 1999 after defeating the Networds Steelers, 45-42, in the AFC Divisional round, ultimately falling to the New England Patriots, 20-24.

Marrone's 2017 squad featured six Pro Bowl selections (CB **A.J. Bouye**, DL **Calais Campbell**, DT **Malik Jackson**, DE **Yannick Ngakoue**, CB **Jalen Ramsey** and LB **Telvin Smith**), while Bouye (second-team), Campbell (first-team), Ramsey (first-team) and Smith (second-team) were all named to the AP All-Pro teams.

In 2016, Marrone's offensive line allowed 34 sacks, 17 fewer than the previous season (51) and 37 fewer than in 2014 (71). The Jaguars' 34 sacks allowed were the fewest sacks allowed by the team since it yielded 31 sacks in 2007. In 2017, the Jaguars set a franchise record with 24 sacks allowed.

In his first season with the Jaguars in 2015, Marrone helped the offensive line provide protection for QB **Blake Bortles**, who set single-season franchise records with 355 completions, 606 pass attempts, 4,428 yards and 35 touchdowns. In addition, Marrone's squad blocked for rockie RB **T.J. Yeldon**, who accounted for 740 rushing yards and 279 receiving yards in 2015, becoming the first Jaguars rockie to surpass 1,000 scrimmage yards since **Maurice Jones-Drew** (1,377) in 2006. Yeldon also placed third among AFC RBs in 2016 with 84.9 scrimmage yards.

Prior to joining the Jaguars, Marrone compiled a 15-17 mark as the head coach of the Bills, including a 9-7 mark in 2014, the team's most wins since 2004. He became only the third coach in Bills history to win 15 games in his first two seasons (Marv Levy, 19; Wade Phillips, 21). The Bills had six Pro Bowl selections during Marrone's two seasons.

The Bills had three different players with 60 receptions in 2014 for the first time in team history (**Fred Jackson**, 65; **Sammy Watkins**, 62; **Robert Woods**, 61) and the club produced six individual 100-yard receiving games. Watkins set team rookie records for receptions and receiving yards (982). The Bills ranked sixth in the NFL in 2014 with a plus-seven turnover differential.

In 2013, Marrone's offensive unit led the AFC and finished second in the NFL in rushing (144.2 avg.), while also leading the league with a 95.5 pct. red zone efficiency mark. Rookie QB **E.J. Manuel** started 10 games and set team rookie records for passing touchdowns (11) and completions (180).

Prior to joining the Bills, Marrone spent four seasons (2009-12) as the head coach of his alma mater, Syracuse, where he led the program to a 21-17 record in his final three seasons. He guided the Orange to an 8-5 mark in 2010 and 2012 and both seasons culminated with a New Era Pinstripe Bowl championship.

The Orange set several school records in 2012, including total yards (5,681), passing yards (3,619) and first downs (300). Marrone earned the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Region 1 Coach of the Year honors in 2011 and was a finalist for the Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year Award.

Marrone spent seven seasons in the NFL (2002-08) before becoming a collegiate head coach. From 2006-08, Marrone served as the offensive coordinator for the New Orleans Saints. He directed an offense that led the NFL in total offense (391.5 avg. in 2006; 410.7 avg. in 2008) and passing yards per game (281.4 avg. in 2006; 311.1 in 2008) in two different seasons (2006-08). The Saints' offensive line held their opponents to the fewest sacks allowed in the NFL in 2006 (16) and tied for the fewest sacks in the NFL from 2006-08 with 52 despite leading the NFL with 1,868 passing attempts during that span. QB **Drew Brees** captured the second passer in NFL history to eclipse 5,000 passing yards (**Dan Marino**, 1984).

Prior to Marrone's arrival in New Orleans, the franchise had never had a 4,000yard passer or registered more than 5,700 yards of offense. Brees eclipsed 4,000 passing yards and the offense posted more than 5,700 yards in each of Marrone's three seasons with the Saints. The Saints established a team record with an NFL-best 6,264 yards of offense in 2006, 5,780 in 2007 (4th in the NFL) and led the NFL again in 2008 with 6,571 yards.

In Marrone's first season as an NFL offensive coordinator in 2006, LT **Jammal Brown** was voted to the All-Pro team and to the Pro Bowl in his first year at the position, while OG **Jahri Evans** was a unanimous All-Rookie selection. The Saints ranked fourth in the NFL in 2007 in total offense and set an NFL record for completions (440) and had franchise bests for passing first downs (222), attempts (652), touchdown passes (28) and completion percentage (67.5). In 2008, the Saints led the NFL in total offense while setting team records for points (463), total yards (6,571), net passing yards (4,977), TDS (57) and first downs (354).

Marrone was the offensive line coach of the New York Jets from 2002-05 and the team made two postseason appearances (2002, 2004) with him on the staff. In 2004, the Jets produced the NFL's third-best rushing offense (149.3 avg.) and **Curtis Martin** led the NFL with 1,697 rushing yards.

Before arriving in New York, Marrone served as tight ends/tackles coach at the University of Tennessee in 2001. He spent the 2000 season at the University of Georgia as offensive line coach after spending the previous five seasons (1995-99) at Georgia Tech where he was part of three consecutive bowl appearances. He was director of football operations for the Yellow Jackets in 1995 before coaching the tight ends in 1996 and offensive line from 1997-99.

Marrone began his coaching career in 1992 at Cortland (N.Y.) State as the school's tight ends coach before stints as the offensive line coach at U.S. Coast Guard Academy (1993) and Northeastern University in 1994. A native of Bronx, N.Y., Marrone was a sixth-round draft pick of the Los Angeles Raiders in 1986 and played two years in the NFL. He played with the Miami Dolphins in 1987 and with the Saints in 1989. He also had playing stints with Pittsburgh, Dallas and Minnesota before closing his career with the NFL Europe's London Monarchs from 1991-92. Marrone was a three-year letterman at Syracuse. He returned to Syracuse and graduated in 1991 with a degree in liberal arts.

KANSAS CITY CHIEFS (1-0)

JACKSONVILLE JAGUARS (0-1)

The Jaguars opened their 25th season at home with high hopes, but were dominated in a 40-26 loss to the Kansas City Chiefs. The excitement of the new season faded quickly when QB Nick Foles was injured on his first-quarter touchdown pass to WR DJ Chark Jr. Foles, making his first start as a Jaguar, ran the team's first 10 plays and completed 5 of 8 passes for 75 yards and capped the second possession with his 35-yard pass to Chark in the endzone. But he was hit hard on the play and suffered a broken left clavicle. In the second-hottest game in team history, 6th-round rookie draft pick QB **Gardner Minshew II** came in hot in relief of Foles by completing his first 13 passes, finishing 22 of 25 for 275 yards and 2 touchdowns. But while the Jacksonville offense was finding its rhythm, Kansas City scored on its first seven possessions including QB **Patrick Mahomes** touchdown passes to WR **Sammy Watkins** of 68, 49 and 3 yards. Even with that offensive output the Chiefs led by just 10 points at 23-13 with 2:30 left in the third quarter. Kansas City added a RB **Damien Williams** touchdown run and Mahomes' quarter. Kansas City added a RB **Damien Williams** touchdown run and Mahomes' third scoring pass to Watkins made it 36-13 in the fourth quarter. Minshew then threw touchdown passes of 15 yards to WR **Dede Westbrook** and 21 yards to WR **Chris Conley** in the final period. Mahomes threw for 313 yards in the first half, and the Chiefs finished the day with 491 yards of offense including 378 passing with Watkins gaining 198 on 9 receptions. Jacksonville managed 428 yards on offense with 347 passing but had two turnovers which the Chiefs converted into 10 points. Minshew's 88% completion rate was a Jaguars team record for QBs making at least 20 attempts. WR **Chris Conley** led Jacksonville with 6 receptions for 97 yards and a touchdown, while Chark had a 69-yard reception and finished with 4 catches for 146 yards and a touchdown. The kickoff temperature of 91 degrees marked the second-hottest game in Jaguars history behind their home opener in Week 2 of 2018.

In their first division game of the season and **Gardner Minshew II's** first NFL start the Jaguars battled back from a 13-3 fourth-quarter deficit, scoring on their final two possessions to get within one point with 30 seconds remaining, but their two-point try to win the game was stopped short and they fell to the Houston Texans, 13-12. Despite outgaining the Texans 281 to 263 the Jaguars struggled to move the ball much of the afternoon, getting their first points on a 40-yard K Josh Lambo field goal late in the second quarter. Houston answered with a 22-yard Ka'imi Fairbanks field goal on the final play of the first half to take a 6-3 lead after the Jacksonville defense held at its own 4-yard line following a 3rd-and-16 Houston conversion. After a scoreless third quarter, Houston took control on the Jaguars' first play of the fourth quarter when a LB **Whitney Mercilus** sack-forced fumble and DE J.J. Watt fumble recovery – the only turnover of the game – set up the Texans offense at the Jacksonville 11-yard line. Four plays later QB **Deshaun Watson** ran it in on 4th-and-1 from the 2 for a 13-3 lead. Minshew and the Jaguars' offense responded on the ensuing possession by driving 61 yards in 9 plays to the Texans' 14, setting up Lambo's 32-yard field goal which made it a one-score game at 13-6. After forcing a Texans punt the Jaguars put together their best drive of the day, taking over at their own 32 with 3:36 left and just one time out. Five runs and 8 passes – including an 18-yard Minshew run on 4th-and-10 – set them up at the Houston 4 from where Minshew threw to WR **DJ Chark Jr.** in the back of the endzone for a touchdown that made the score 13-12. A RB Leonard Fournette run up the middle was stopped short on the 2-point try, and Houston then recovered the Jaguars' onside kick. The Jaguars' 9 penalties on the day wiped out gains of 29, 29 and 9 yards, but they scored on all three possessions on which they crossed midfield.

K Josh Lambo's 33-yard field goal as time expired gave the Jaguars a thrilling 26-24 come-from-behind win in Denver to even their record at 2-2. With RB Leonard Fournette rushing for a career-high 225 yards and QB Gardner Minshew II escaping a fierce pass rush to complete passes, the Jaguars overcame a 14-point second-quarter deficit by scoring twice in the third quarter. The first half was all Denver as the Broncos built a 17-3 lead with 4:16 remaining in the half on two QB Joe Flacco touchdown passes and a 33-yard field goal. Denver's next possession ended with the game's only turnover, an interception by S Ronnie Harrison which he returned 31 yards to the Denver 43, and Lambo kicked a 40-yard field goal seven plays later for a 17-6 halftime score. Turning to the run game, the Jaguars marched 75 yards in 16 plays and ate up 10:24 to open the third quarter – with 11 Fournette runs including 6 straight – and Minshew II capped the drive with a 7-yard touchdown pass to RB Ryquell Armstead. After forcing a three-and-out Jacksonville took its first lead of the day at 20-17 on its next series when Minshew found TE James 0'Shaughnessy in the end zone with an 18-yard pass. That drive, which started at the Jacksonville 7-yard line, began with Fournette's 81-yard run, the second-longest in team history. In the fourth quarter the Jaguars extended their lead to six at 23-17 on Lambo's 34-yard field goal that capped a 13-play, 78-yard drive. But Denver took back the lead on the ensuing possession, driving 75 yards in 6 plays with two 27-yard completions before Flacco threw 8 yards to WR Courtland Sutton for the touchdown and a 24-23 lead with 1:32 left. Facing a relentless pass rush, Minshew turned in his first game-winning drive by completing passes of 21 yards, his fourth straight 200-yard performance. On the Panthers' ensuing possession a 56-yard field goal try was tipped at the line by DL **Calais Campbell**, and the Jaguars took over at their own 46 to set up K **Josh Lambo's** 35-yard field goal to make it 21-17 with 58 seconds remaining in the first half. McCaffrey, who accounted for 237 yards from scrimmage and 18 points on the day, seemed to break the game open on the Panthers' first play of the third quarter when he went 84 yards untouched to stake a 28-17 lead. But once again the Jaguars responded, with RB Leonard Fourmette crashing in from Minshew to Chark. In the fourth quarter Lambo's 38-yard field goal made it a one-point game at 28-27 with 5:52 remaining, but once again the Panthers broke off a long run when RB **Reggie Bonnafon** charged 59 yards to the end zone, and a missed PAT made things interesting with Carolina clinging to a 7-point lead with 3:34 left. Minshew was sacked and lost a third fumble on the Jaguars' next possession, but the Jaguars got the ball back at their own 5 with 1:45 remaining and a chance to tie. They reached the Carolina 24 in 10 plays, but Minshew's final pass was knocked down to end the game on an untimed down. The Jaguars yielded 285 rushing yards, the second-most in team history, led by McCaffrey's 176 and two touchdowns. Fournette turned in his second straight 100-yard game with 108 yards and a touchdowns. 164 yards and 2 touchdowns.
