THE MATCHUP

The NFC South-leading Saints (6-1) host the 3-3-1 Cardinals on Sunday afternoon, with New Orleans looking to go into a Week nine bye on the high of a six-game winning streak

Two sacks by defensive end **Cameron Jordan**, two fumble recoveries and a stifling Saints run defense that allowed only 17 yards, the fifth lowest total in franchise history, played a significant role in their 36-25 victory against the Chicago Bears on Sunday.

After dropping a 27-9 decision at the Los Angeles Rams on September 15, New Orleans has picked up with a five-game winning streak, the sixth such run since Head Coach **Sean Payton** took the reigns of the Saints in 2006 and tenth overall.

Payton has led the surge by emphasizing toughness on offense, defense and special teams not only on gameday, but out on the practice field, in the meeting room and in the weight room, despite the loss of quarterback **Drew Brees** to thumb surgery. Out of it has come the ability to win a battle in the trenches in a challenging location like Chicago. While surrendering only one sack on Sunday, the Saints offensive line overpowered the Bears defensive front helping New Orleans rush for 151 yards.

The matchup against Minnesota required a patient, balanced approach on offense and sticking with some run despite some early struggles. Running back **Latavius Murray** served as the feature back with **Alvin Kamara** out and carried the load, carrying 27 times for 119 yards (4.4 avg.) with two touchdowns and catching five passes for 31

yards for 150 total yards from scrimmage.

In the passing game, fourth-year wide receiver **Michael Thomas** again helped quarterback **Teddy Bridgewater** in powering the passing attack, grabbing nine balls for 131 yards, including a 34-yard catch from the signal-caller who has shined with nine touchdowns and only two interceptions in 2019. Thomas continues to impress as he ranks among league leaders with 58 receptions for 669 yards and four touchdowns. Bridgewater completed 23-of-38 passes for 281 yards with two touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 100.9 passer rating.

On a defense led by a pair of team captains in Jordan, who ranks first on the club with seven sacks and moved into sole possession of third place in club record books in quarterback takedowns and linebacker **Demario Davis**, who has a 55 stops other younger players are stepping up. Safety **Vonn Bell** became the first Saint since 2001 with four fumble recoveries in a season. Linebacker **A.J. Klein** also added a fumble recovery and three solo stops.

Special Teams also stepped up against the Bears. Defensive back **J.T. Gray** blocked a punt on the first possession of the game and the Saints exited with a safety. Fullback **Zach Line** also tipped a punt. Safety **Marcus Williams** posted two special teams stops to go with a forced fumble on defense, while the punt coverage teams held Bears running back **Tarik Cohen** to six yards on a pair of punt returns.

In The NFC South This Week: The Tampa Bay Buccaneers (2-4) will travel to the Tennessee Titans (3-4), the Carolina Panthers (4-2) will travel to the San Francisco 49ers (6-0), while Atlanta (1-6) will host the Seattle Seahawks (5-2).

Cardinals QB **Kliff Kingsbury** spent the 2004 season on the Saints practice squad...New Orleans WR **Ted Ginn Jr.** played for the Cardinals in 2014. Ginn was tutored by Cardinals Offensive Assistant/Assistant Quarterbacks Coach **Cam Turner** in Carolina from 2015-16. Ginn and Saints LB **A.J. Klein** played with Cardinals WR **Damiere Byrd** in Carolina in 2016...Saints DB **J.T. Gray** spent his junior season at Coolidge (Ariz.) HS, where he earned Arizona Division IV Section II first team as a DB and second team as an RB in 2012...Saints Director of Player Development **Fred McAfee** played for the Cardinals in 1994... Cardinals Assistant Head Coach/Special Teams Coordinator **Jeff Rodgers** attended Westlake (Austin, Texas) HS, the same high school as Saints QB **Drew Brees**. Rodgers served on Saints Linebackers Coach **Mike Nolan's** staff when he was head coach of the 49ers from 2005-07. Nolan and Saints Defensive Coordinator **Dennis Allen** served on the same Denver Staff in 2011. Rodgers and Saints Senior Offensive Assistant **Curtis Johnson** served on the same Chicago staff in 2016...Cardinals Defensive Coordinator **Vance Joseph** has a history in the New Orleans area, attending Archbishop Shaw (Marrero) HS, where he led his team to a 37-6 record in three seasons as the starting quarterback and won the 4A state championship as a sophomore. He earned USA Today honorable mention All-American as a senior and also lettered all four seasons in basketball. His older brother Mickey, is currently the wide receivers coach at LSU. Saints secondary Coach **Aaron Glenn** and Joseph were tutored by Saints Senior Defensive Assistant **Peter Giunta** with the New York Jets in 1995. Giunta served on Nolan's San Francisco staff from 2005-08. Nolan also served on the same Dolphins staff with Saints Special Teams Coordinator **Darren Rizzi** in Miami in 2016, along with Arizona Assistant Linebackers Coach **Charlie Bullen**. Arizona Linebackers Coach **Bill Davis** served as Nolan's defensive coordinator in San Francisco from 2005-06...Cardinals Passing Game Coordinator/Quarterbacks **Tom Clements** was quarterbacks coach for the Saints from 1997-99...Saints Pass Rush Specialist **Brian Young** and Cardinals Assistant Offensive Line Coach **Brian Natkin** were college teammates at UTEP... Cardinals Defensive Backs Coach **Marcus Robertson** Assistant Strength and Conditioning Coach **Vernon Stephens** served on Allen's staff when he was head coach of the Oakland Raiders in 2014...Cardinals CB **Patrick Peterson**, played at LSU...Saints DE **Cameron Jordan** prepped at Chandler (Ariz.) LAST MEETING

Saints 48, Arizona Cardinals 41; December 18, 2016 @ University of Phoenix Stadium – After a two-game struggle on offense in the final month of 2016, New Orleans was able to sustain drives and couple that with explosive plays down the field, to put together their most complete game on offense in several weeks in the club's first regular season victory at University of Phoenix Stadium in their third attempt.

The Saints would have to overcome an early mistake as on Arizona's first drive, RB **Kerwynn Williams** took a direct snap and took it 49 yards for the score, giving the Cardinals the early 7-0 advantage. On New Orleans' ensuing drive, the offense went 56 yards over 14 plays but a sack of QB **Drew Brees** on first down would hurt the drive. K **Wil Lutz** would hit his first of two field goals on the day, this one from 37 yards out. The Saints would take advantage of a WR **Larry Fitzgerald** fumble on the next Cardinals drive, with DE **Paul Kruger** forcing it and LB **Craig Robertson** recovering the ball at the Arizona 30-yard line. Brees would find RB **Travaris Cadet** for the ten-yard touchdown, giving New Orleans their first lead at 10-7.

However, after Brees was sacked by Cardinals LB **Markus Golden** on the Saints' next possession, he would fumble and DT **Calais Campbell** would scoop the ball and take it 53 yards for the defensive touchdown. New Orleans would answer with WR **Brandin Cooks** breaking coverage downfield and catching a 65-yard touchdown. After forcing an Arizona punt, Cooks would again make the Cardinals defense pay, this time on a 45-yard touchdown. Before the half, Arizona QB **Carson Palmer** would lead the Cardinals offense on an eight-play, 80-yard drive that ended with a 10-yard touchdown to WR **J.J. Nelson** to bring the score to 24-20.

After trading possessions to start the second half, New Orleans would go on a 14-play, 68-yard drive that culminated in a 39-yard Lutz field goal to bring the Saints lead to seven. Arizona would quickly answer with RB **David Johnson** scoring his first of two touchdowns on the day, this one from the Saints two-yard line. Not to be outdone, RB **Tim Hightower** scored his first of two touchdowns on the day on the following Saints possession, a three-yard score. Arizona would once again tie the ballgame with Palmer orchestrating a seven-play, 75-yard drive that ended with another Johnson rushing score. In a game full of lead changes, Brees and the New Orleans offense would go on a seven-play, 75-yard drive of their own with Brees connecting with WR **Michael Thomas** on a four-yard touchdown, reclaiming the lead for good at 41-34.

On the next Cardinals possession, rookie S **Vonn Bell** would cause a fumble that would be recovered by fellow rookie CB **Ken Crawley**, paving the way for Hightower's second rushing score.

Brees finished the day completing 37-of-48 passes for 389 yards, four touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 127.9 passer rating, setting season-highs in completions and attempts and tying the season best for scoring throws. Cooks finished with seven receptions for 186 yards and two scoring grabs.

THE COACHES

New Orleans Saints Head Coach **Sean Payton** has posted a 132-81 overall record (.620), including an 8-6 postseason mark after the franchise had won only one playoff game prior to his arrival in 2006. Payton holds both the club's top victory total and winning percentage. Payton is ranked 30th all-time in National Football League record books in victories, fifth among active head coaches. He continues to represent the Saints as the model of stability not only within the NFC South, as he is the longest tenured head coach within the division, but also among the most accomplished within the National Football League. Only the New England Patriots' Bill Belichick (2000) has been with the his team longer than Payton's 14 seasons. Payton is also one of just seven active National Football League head coaches to lead a team to a Super Bowl victory. The others are Belichick, the Seattle Seahawks' Pete Carroll, the Oakland Raiders' Jon Gruden (Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2002), the Baltimore Ravens' John Harbaugh, the Philadelphia Eagles' Doug Pederson and the Pittsburgh Steelers' Mike Tomlin. The 2018 Saints edition posted a 13-3 regular season record, secured the NFC's number one seed for the postseason and advanced to the NFC Championship game for the third time. A franchise-record five players were selected to the *Associated Press* All-Pro team and a club-best eight were named to the Pro Bowl. New Orleans' ten-game winning streak was the second-longest in club history and the longest run of consecutive victories in the National Football League in 2018. The streak only sits behind in club record books, New Orleans' 13-0 start under Payton in 2009, the season when they captured Super Bowl XLIV. New Orleans ranked third in the National Football League in points per game, eighth in total offense and sixth in rushing offense. A stingy run defense ranked second in both opponent rushing yards per game and opponent rushing yards per play. The 2019 campaign has started with a 6-1 record for the Black and Gold, standing in sole possession of first place in the NFC South division after a convincing 36-25 win at the Chicago Bears on Sunday. Payton earned a bachelor's degree in communications at Eastern Illinois, where as a quarterback he had 10,665 passing yards, at the time the third-highest total in NCAA Division I-AA history. Payton was inducted into the Eastern Illinois Hall of Fame in September of 2000 and had his jersey retired in a ceremony in September of 2010. He received an honorary doctorate from his alma mater in 2013. Payton was born December 29, 1963 in San Mateo, California, and raised in Naperville, Illinois, Payton has a daughter, Meghan and a son, Connor.

Kliff Kingsbury became a National Football League head coach for the first time when hired by the Arizona Cardinals on January 11, 2019. Kingsbury has put the Cardinals in contention in his first season with a 3-3-1 record, already surpassing their 2018 victory total. Kingsbury

came to Arizona after spending the past six seasons (2013-18) as the head coach at his alma mater, Texas Tech, where he also called the plays for the Red Raiders offense that annually ranked among the top units in the country. In 2016, Texas Tech led the nation in total offense (566.6 ypg), passing offense (463.0 ypg) and ranked fifth in scoring offense (43.7 ppg). Texas Tech averaged at least 30 points per game, 470 total yards per game and 300 passing yards per game in all six seasons. Patrick Mahomes, the National Football League MVP in 2018, spent two full seasons (2015-16) as the starter at Texas Tech under Kingsbury during which the Red Raiders finished nationally #1 (2016) and #2 (2015) in total offense.

Kingsbury played quarterback at Texas Tech (1999-2002) where he set 39 school records, 16 Big 12 marks and 17 NCAA records during his collegiate career while throwing for 12,423 yards and 95 touchdowns. He was drafted in the sixth round (201st overall) of the National Football League Draft by New England in 2003, spent the 2004 season on the New Orleans Saints practice squad and played with the New York Jets in 2005. He played with the Cologne Centurions of NFL Europe in 2006 before attending training camp with the Bills that summer. Kingsbury finished his playing career in the Canadian Football League with the Montreal Alouettes and Winnipeg Blue Bombers in 2007. He played high school football under his father, Tim, at New Braunfels (Texas) High School. Kingsbury earned a bachelor's degree in Management from Texas Tech in 2001. Began coaching collegiately at Houston (2008-2011) and Texas A&M (2012). Under Kingsbury's guidance, Mahomes (2016) and Houston's Case Keenum (2009, 2011) both led the nation in passing.

SERIES HISTORY

The Saints and Cardinals have played 29 times in the regular season, with the Saints trailing 14-15. The Cardinals won the first three games in the series, including both played in 1968 when they were in the NFL Century division. The Saints won their first game against the Cardinals on Nov. 2, 1969, 51-42 at Busch Stadium. In another memorable contest, the Saints beat the Cardinals 14-0 on Dec. 8, 1974 in the team's final contest played at Tulane Stadium:

GAME SUMMARIES

WEEK 1: Saints 30, Houston Texans 28; September 9, 2019 @ Mercedes-Benz Superdome – After a rough start and trailing by as much as 11 points at halftime, the Saints pulled off a thrilling 30-28 comeback victory, complete with six sacks, an S **Marcus Williams** pick, a balanced offense and a 58-yard field goal as time expired.

In the Monday night opener, QB **Drew Brees** finished with 370 passing yards, two touchdowns and a 105.8 rating. WR **Michael Thomas** topped the receiving corps with 123 yards on ten receptions. WR **Ted Ginn Jr.** added seven receptions for 101 yards and a 41-yard grab. RB **Alvin Kamara** led in rushing with 97 yards on 13 carries and had seven receptions for 72 yards. **Latavius Murray** carried the ball six times for 43 yards with a 30-yard touchdown.

The rough start began with an unproductive first offensive drive for New Orleans followed by a series where Texans OLB **Whitney Mercilus** picked off a Brees pass intended for Murray at the Houston four-year line. Houston QB **Deshawn Watson** then engineered a seven-play, 94-yard drive that ended with a 21-yard rushing touchdown by the third-year signal-caller. New Orleans' offense wouldn't remain scoreless for long though as K **Wil Lutz** drilled a 32-yard field goal. The Texans then extended the lead to 14-3 on a two-yard touchdown from Watson to WR **Deandre Hopkins**.

The Saints got the ball first in the third quarter and scored their first touchdown of 2019 and moved within four on Murray's scoring run. But the Texans answered with a 16-yard touchdown connection from Watson to Hopkins. However on New Orleans' next possession, the Saints answered with a seven-yard touchdown pass from Brees to QB **Taysom Hill**, followed up by Williams' pick.

On the first play of the fourth quarter, New Orleans took their first lead of the night when Brees connected with WR **Tre'Quan Smith** on a 14-yard touchdown. Following another Lutz field goal, the Texans answered when Watson found Texans WR **Kenny Stills** for a 37-yard touchdown reception with 37 seconds left.

Brees then completed three quick passes and spiked the ball twice. After New Orleans used their final timeout, Lutz, who missed a 56-yard field goal near the end of the first half, connected on a career-long 58-yard field goal as time expired to give the Saints the win. For his last-second heroics, coach **Sean Payton** awarded Lutz with a game ball.

Lutz was perfect on all three point after tries, and drove all five of his kickoffs out for touchbacks. It was New Orleans' first season opening victory since 2013.

WEEK 2: Los Angeles Rams 27, Saints 9; September

15, 2019 @ Los Angeles Veterans Memorial Coliseum – New Orleans struggled to put together consistent drives on offense and despite a gritty defensive effort, struggled on offense when both **Drew Brees** and **Teddy Bridgewater** quarterbacked the team. After struggling with penalties, the Saints offense was unable to overcome that on third down, finishing just 4-of-13 on their third down attempts.

Following an interception by Rams S **John Johnson**, Los Angeles capped their first drive, a seven-play 3:43 minute drive with a 24-yard field goal by K **Greg Zuerlein** to get on the scoreboard first, a lead they would never relinquish. After a second unsuccessful series by the Saints offense, Brees was forced to leave the game with a thumb injury. However, the Rams offense was unable to score on their next three offensive drives, as a sack by DE **Cameron Jordan** ended one and a fumble recovery by the All-Pro end the other. On the Saints' first possession of the second quarter, powered by a 19-yard punt return by WR/RS **Deonte Harris**, K **Wil Lutz** connected on a 30-yard field goal to put the Saints on the board. Following a failed fourth down attempt by the Saints and a subsequent 20-yard run by Rams RB **Todd Gurley**, Zuerlein converted a 22-yard field goal at the end of the first half. Besides a pair of field goals, the Saints offense wasn't able to get going in the second half and the Rams used an four-yard touchdown run by Gurley and a two-yard touchdown connection between QB **Jared Goff** and WR **Brandin Cooks** to extend the lead.

WEEK 3: New Orleans Saints 33, Seattle Seahawks 27; September 22, 2019 @ CenturyLink Field – RB **Alvin Kamara** powered the New Orleans offensive attack, grinding out 161 total yards from scrimmage and two touchdowns stake the Saints to a 33-27 victory to improve to 2-1. The Saints defense and special teams did the rest, stopping four fourth down conversions and dominating the kicking game, while creating 13 points.

Kamara rushed for 69 yards and caught nine passes for 92 yards, scoring touchdowns on the ground and through the air. QB **Teddy Bridgewater**, starting in place of an injured **Drew Brees**, completed 19-of-27 passes for 177 yards with two touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 112.7 rating as the Saints garnered their first road win of 2019.

While the Saints defense surrendered 515 total net yards, they made stops or big plays at the most opportune times, including stopping four fourth down attempts for the first time since at Jacksonville on October 2, 2011. Seattle running backs only accounted for 58 yards on 19 carries, while CB **Eli Apple** forced Seahawks RB **Chris Carson** to fumble in the second quarter and it was picked up by S **Vonn Bell**, returned 33 yards for a touchdown.

Special teams also played an important role in the victory in several facets. Early in the first quarter, rookie WR/RS **Deonte Harris** returned a punt 53 yards for a touch-down to give New Orleans a 7-0 lead. P **Thomas Morstead** and the club's coverage units were dominant in the kicking game as the 11th-year special teams captain punted six times for 324 yards for a 54.0 gross punting average and a 52.0 net. Four of Morstead's punts fell inside the 20-yard line, two inside the five. DB **J.T. Gray** had a career-high and game-high three special teams stops.

- Bell finished the game with nine tackles, one pass defensed and the fumble recovery returned for a touchdown
- Kamara led New Orleans in receiving with nine grabs for 92 yards with a 29-yard scoring grab. WR **Michael Thomas** caught five passes for 54 yards and a one-yard touchdown as he joined Odell Beckham Jr. and Anquan Boldin as the only players in NFL history with at least 300 catches and 4,000 receiving yards in their first 50 games.
- An inspired effort against the run surrendered only 58 yards rushing on 19 carries to Seattle running backs, including only 53 yards on 15 carries (3.5 avg.) with one fumble lost for Seahawks starter **Chris Carson**. CB **Marshon Lattimore** led the Saints with a career-high 12 tackles (ten solo), while LB **Demario Davis** finished tied for second with Bell with nine stops.
- With the punt return for a touchdown and the fumble return for a score, it marked the third time in franchise history the Saints scored an offensive, defensive and special teams touchdown in the same game, joining at 31-24 win over Philadelphia at Tulane Stadium on November 5, 1967 and a 31-24 loss at Minnesota on November 8, 1998.
- The victory gave New Orleans an 8-6 record against the Seahawks in the regular season, their second consecutive victory against Seattle. After two postseason losses and one regular season loss in Seattle, it marked the first time the Saints won at CenturyLink Field since the 2007 season.

WEEK 4: Saints 12, Dallas Cowboys 10; September 29, 2019 @ Mercedes-Benz Superdome – The Saints won their second consecutive game, defeating Dallas at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome in a contest dominated by defense and special teams. It marked the first time New Orleans won a game without scoring a touchdown since an Oct. 25, 1998 9-3 victory over Tampa Bay.

The Saints won the coin toss and deferred. After the Cowboys punted, the Cowboys took advantage of an inter-

ception off a bobbled ball by WR **Ted Ginn Jr.** and took possession at their 46-yard line. Dallas jumped out to a 3-0 lead compliments of a 28-yard field goal by K **Brett Maher**. New Orleans started pushing back when WR/RS **Deonte Harris** returned a kickoff 29 yards in a drive that spanned the first and second quarters and went nine plays and 52 yards, K **Wil Lutz** drilled a 40-yard field goal. New Orleans then forced a quick three-and-out, Harris returned the punt to the Saints 49 and Lutz hit a 42-yard field goal to give New Orleans the edge. A potential score was averted when on a completion from Cowboys QB **Dak Prescott** to TE **Jason Witten**, LB **A.J. Klein** punched the ball out and it was recovered by S **Vonn Bell**. Towards the end of the quarter, Bell forced a fumble by Cowboys RB **Ezekiel Elliott** and recovered it, setting the stage for a 19-yard field goal by Lutz and a 9-3 Saints halftime lead.

Midway through the third quarter, Prescott completed a pass for a 35-yard gain to TE **Blake Jarwin**, that set up a one-yard rushing touchdown by Elliott to give the Dallas a 10-9 lead.

Between the third and fourth quarters, QB Teddy Bridgewater drove the offense 67 yards in 15 plays on a drive that lasted 9:06 and Lutz drilled a 26-yard field goal for the lead. New Orleans held on for the win with DT **David Onyemata** dropping Prescott for a 11-yard loss and S **Marcus Williams** picking him off on the final play of the contest to seal the victory.

Bridgewater threw for 193 yards and WR **Michael Thomas** had nine receptions for 95 yards to move into a tie for the NFL receiving lead with 34 grabs and tie Odele Beckham Jr. for reaching 350 career catches in the fewest games in NFL history (52 games). Defensively, Bell led the team with ten tackles.

Week 5: Saints 31, Tampa Bay Buccaneers 24; October 6, 2019 @ Mercedes-Benz Superdome – New Orleans put together one of their more complete games as they recorded a victory over their NFC South divisional rivals in the start of their 2019 division slate.

After gaining three first downs on their first possession, New Orleans was forced to punt. However, on Tampa Bay's next possession, the Saints defense would force a three-and-out and a punt. Starting the ensuing drive on their own 36-yard line, QB **Teddy Bridgewater** would lead a nine-play, 53-yard drive that culminated in a **Wil Lutz** 29-yard field goal to give the Saints the early lead. Two possession later, after Buccaneers CB **Sean Murphy-Bunting** picked off Bridgewater after a ball bounced off of WR **Ted Ginn Jr.**, QB **Jameis Winston** and the Tampa Bay offense would take advantage of great field position as he would find WR **Chris Godwin** for a 26-yard touchdown to take a 7-3 lead. **CONTINUED ON NEXT PAGE**

On the next Saints possession, they'd regain the lead, with Bridgewater connecting with WR **Michael Thomas** on a 14-yard touchdown. Tampa Bay K **Matt Gay** connected on a 42-yard field goal to tie the score again. But the Saints took the lead back with 37 seconds left in the first half when Bridgewater and TE **Jared Cook** connected for a nine-yard touchdown.

The Saints then got the ball coming out of the second half and Bridgewater connected on a 42-yard completion to Thomas and then two plays later found Ginn for a 33-yard touchdown. The Buccaneers struck back by going on a 17-play, 75-yard drive that ended with a two-yard touchdown run by RB **Peyton Barber** to put the Buccaneers back within seven. Near the end of the third quarter, the Saints were pinned back at their nine on third-and-ten and Bridgewater found Thomas for a 20-yard completion to keep a crucial drive alive.

The drive would stay alive in the fourth quarter, eventually going for 13-plays and 91 yards as Bridgewater found Thomas for a nine-yard touchdown, as the signal-caller tied his career-high for scoring throws. The clubs traded three and outs, but then the Saints pass rush became active with three sacks on a single series to forced a punt. The Buccaneers offense would strike again with Godwin hauling in a 26-yard touchdown from Winston to make it a one-score game. But the onside kick attempt went out of bounds to give New Orleans the ball back for a victory formation.

WEEK 6: Saints 13, Jacksonville Jaguars 6; October 13, 2019 @ TIAA Bank Field – The Saints won their fourth consecutive game, defeating Jacksonville in a contest dominated by defense and special teams, with timely offensive plays mixed in. It marked the first time New Orleans didn't surrender a touchdown since a 20-0 shutout of the Miami Dolphins in London on October 1, 2017.

The Jaguars won the coin toss and deferred. The clubs traded punts for each of their first two possessions. New Orleans jumped out to a 3-0 lead compliments of a 47-yard field goal by K **Wil Lutz**. New Orleans took a bend but don't break approach on a Jacksonville drive midway through the second quarter as Jaguars QB **Gavin Minshew** completed 12- and 22-yard passes to WR **D.J. Chark**, followed by some nifty runs by RB **Leonard Fournette**. But the Saints kept the Jaguars out of the end zone at their four-yard line and forced a 22-yard **Josh Lambo** field goal to close out the only scoring of the first half.

New Orleans recorded the only takeaway game on the

first drive of the second half when CB **Marshon Lattimore** picked off a pass intended for Chark. The Saints would take the lead back on the next drive when Lutz drilled a 21-yard field goal. Midway through the third quarter, Minshew completed a pass for a 23-yard gain to WR **Dede Westbrook**, that set up a 32-yard Lambo field goal.

Between the third and fourth quarters, QB **Teddy Bridgewater** drove the offense 75 yards in 11 plays on a drive that lasted 6:22 and he eventually connected with TE **Jared Cook** on a four-yard touchdown pass. New Orleans then defended a Jacksonville drive on downs at the Saints 40 and despite a quick three and out, then forced a Jaguars punt. The Saints then wouldn't give the ball back, holding it for the final 6:09 of the contest, converting three first downs.

Bridgewater threw for 240 yards and WR **Michael Thomas** had eight receptions for 89 yards to hold the NFL receiving lead. Defensively, DE **Cameron Jordan** recorded two sacks to move into a tie with LB **Pat Swilling** for third place on the club's all-time list.

WEEK 7: Saints 36, Chicago Bears 25; October 20, 2019 @ Soldier Field – Vonn Bell and A.J. Klein each recorded fumble recoveries, one of which **Teddy Bridgewater** converted into a touchdown pass to help New Orleans increase their winning streak to five with a 36-25 win over Chicago at Soldier Field, the Saints' fifth consecutive victory over the Bears.

The Saints held Chicago to only 17 rushing yards, the fifth-lowest opponent total in franchise history and kept their run offense from getting a first down for only the fourth time in franchise record books. As part of the dominating defensive performance, **Cameron Jordan** recorded two sacks to move into sole possession for their place on the club's all-time list

Offensively, **Latavius Murray** rushed for 119 yards and two touchdowns, New Orleans' first 100-yard rusher of the season. He added 31 yards on five receptions for 150 total yards from scrimmage. Bridgewater improved his touchdown pass-interception on the season to 9-2, throwing scoring throws to **Josh Hill** and **Taysom Hill**. **Michael Thomas** had nine receptions for 131 yards (14.6 avg.). Bridgewater competed 23 of 38 passes for 281 yards and a 100.9 passer rating.

New Orleans jumped out to a 9-0 lead on a safety from a **J.T. Gray** blocked punt and a Bridgewater-Hill touchdown connection. The Bears took the lead early in the second quarter on **Eddy Pineiro's** 46-yard field goal but New Orleans took the lead for good on a 39-yard kick by **Wil Lutz**, his NFL-record 35th consecutive road field goal. That was the start of 27 unanswered points by New Orleans in the contest.

FAMILY TIES

Numerous Saints players, coaches and administrators are not the only members of their families to make a name for themselves in pro football. No fewer than 19 Saints players, coaches or front office staff have relatives who have played, coached or served in the front office in the NFL.

Defensive Coordinator Dennis Allen - Father, Grady, played linebacker for the Atlanta Falcons from 1968-72.

Offensive Coordinator Pete Carmichael - Father, Pete, served as an assistant coach in the NFL from 1994-2003 with the Jacksonville Jaguars and the Chicago Bears.

Quarterbacks Coach Joe Lombardi - The grandson of legendary NFL head coach Vince Lombardi, who led both Green Bay and Washington. He led the Packers to three straight and five overall NFL Championships in seven years, in addition to winning the first two Super Bowls.

Secondary Coach Aaron Glenn - Younger brother, Jason, was a linebacker and sixth-round draft pick of the Detroit Lions in the 2001 NFL Draft, playing six seasons in the NFL with the Jets, Dolphins and Vikings.

Linebackers Coach Mike Nolan - Father, Dick, played safety in the NFL for nine years before becoming a coach. He led the San Francisco 49ers from 1968 to 1975 and was the head coach of the Saints from 1978 to 1980.

Offensive Assistant D.J. Williams - Father, Doug Williams, is Washington's Senior VP/Player Personnel, who won Super Bowl XXII as starting quarterback for the Redskins, the pinnacle of a storied 12-year pro football career, which includes him being in the Buccaneers Ring of Honor.

Assistant GM/College Scouting Director Jeff Ireland - Stepson of Chiefs Hall of Fame LB/C E.J. Holub and the grandson of former Philadelphia Eagles running back and Chicago Bears personnel exec. Jim Parmer.

National Scout Terry Wooden - Brother, JoJo, is Director of Player Personnel for the Los Angeles Chargers.

CN Ken Crawley - Cousin, Stephon Morris, spent the 2012 season with the New England Patriots

DE Mario Edwards Jr. - Father, Mario Edwards Sr., played five NFL seasons at cornerback for the Cowboys (2000-03) and Buccaneers (2004).

DE Cameron Jordan - Father, Steve, had a 13-year career at tight end for the Vikings, with six Pro Bowl selections.

WR Michael Thomas - Uncle, Keyshawn Johnson, is a former wide receiver who was the first overall pick in the 1996 NFL Draft by the New York Jets, spending 11 seasons in the National Football League with the Jets, Buccaneers, Cowboys and Panthers, earning three Pro Bowls and the Super Bowl XXXVII title.

DT Shy Tuttle - Uncle, Perry Tuttle played wide receiver on Clemson's national championship team in 1981 who was a first round pick of Buffalo in 1982 and played three NFL seasons with the Bills, Atlanta and Tampa Bay.

Area Scout Scott Campbell - Late father, Marion, played for the San Francisco 49ers and Philadelphia Eagles, was a longtime assistant with five teams and was former head coach of the Eagles and Atlanta Falcons.

Area Scout Joey Vitt - Father, Joe Vitt, is a longtime NFL assistant coach, who served as assistant head coach/linebackers of the Saints from 2006-16 and is currently assistant head coach/inside linebackers of the Jets.

Combine Scout Matt Phillips - Father, Ted is the president/CEO of the Chicago Bears.

COACHES IN THE NFL

Seven members of the 2018 Saints coaching staff have prior playing experience in the National Football League.

Head Coach **Sean Payton** - Played for the Chicago Bears in 1987.

Assistant Head Coach/Tight Ends **Dan Campbell** - A third round draft pick of the New York Giants in 1999 out of Texas A&M, who appeared in 114 games with 75 starts for the Giants, Dallas Cowboys and Detroit Lions, where he caught 91 passes for 934 yards and 11 touchdowns during his playing career.

Assistant Wide Receivers Coach **Ronald Curry** - A seventh round draft pick (235th overall) of the Oakland Raiders in 2002 out of the North Carolina and played for Oakland from 2002-08, appearing in 76 games with 32 starts, registering 193 receptions for 2,347 yards with 13 touchdowns.

Secondary Coach **Aaron Glenn** - The 12th overall pick of

the New York Jets in 1994 out of Texas A&M and started 176 of 205 games with five teams and was a three-time Pro Bowl selection. Glenn recorded 41 interceptions with six brought back for touchdowns, adding a score on a kick return.

Defensive Assistant **Leigh Torrence**— Enjoyed a seven-year career with the Atlanta Falcons, Washington and Saints.

Special Teams Asst. **Michael Wilhoite** - Played six seasons (2012-17) with the San Francisco 49ers and Seattle Seahawks. After the team had captured only two division titles prior to 2006, the club has five under Payton, including back-to-back NFC South titles from 2017-18, the first time the club won their division in back to back seasons. The franchise has had 13 winning seasons overall in its 52-season history, seven happening under Payton's watch including the 2018 13-3 mark. Payton has the highest winning percentage (.620) and most wins (132) among the 16 Saints head coaches, also ranked 29th all-time in National Football League record books, fifth among active head coaches.

Payton's the only coach in Saints history with double-digit win totals in seven seasons, including the 2018 13-3 mark.

Those 2017 and 2018 totals are tied with the 2009 team for the sixth-lowest total surrendered in franchise history. The 12 sacks given up in 2019 are tied for seventh-lowest after New Orleans only allowed QB Teddy Bridgewater to be dropped once in the 36-25 win at Chicago on Sunday.

Ahead is a synopsis of several returning players and newcomers through the draft, free agency and trade to the 2019 Saints offensive line:

LT Terron Armstead - The club's first third round draft choice in 2013 out of Arkansas-Pine Bluff, Armstead impressed scouts by running the fastest 40-yard dash time (4.71) by an offensive lineman in the history of the NFL Scouting Combine. He has opened 63 regular season games for New Orleans and six postseason contests and received his first Pro Bowl and *Associated Press* All-Pro selections in 2018, having opened ten regular season contests and both playoff games.

C/G Nick Easton - Originally signed as an undrafted free agent by Baltimore out of Harvard, Easton developed into a starting swing guard/center by his second season and opened 17 contests for Minnesota. The North Carolina native signed with New Orleans to provide interior depth.

T/G Andrus Peat - A first round selection (13th overall) in the 2015 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Peat was considered one of the top college offensive linemen in 2014. In his first five seasons, Peat has played in 59 games with 54 starts,

opening a contest at every position except center. In 2018, opened 12 contests at left guard and one at left tackle and both postseason games at left guard as he was named to the Pro Bowl for the first time.

RT Ryan Ramczyk - The Black and Gold used their second first round selection in the 2017 NFL Draft to snag Ramczyk out of Wisconsin, viewed by many as one of the best linemen in the entire draft. After opening all 16 games and both postseason contests in 2017 and being selected as a PFWA All-Rookie, he was an *Associated Press* All-Pro selection at right tackle in 2018, not missing an offensive snap both postseason contests and all 15 regular games at the right tackle position where he is now a cornerstone.

C Erik McCoy - New Orleans traded up in the second round of the 2019 NFL Draft to select this standout from Texas A&M, who was a three-year starter, anchoring the middle of the Aggies offensive line. In 2018, he was a team captain who paved the way for the Southeastern Conference's leading rusher and was the first Saint in franchise history to start at center in Week One.

RG Larry Warford - Originally selected by Detroit in the third round of the 2013 NFL Draft (65th overall) out of Kentucky, this seventh-year blocker brought size, strength and foot quickness to the Saints' line in 2017, as he started all 14 regular season games he played in and both postseason contests at right guard. New Orleans' rush offense responded to his addition, as the ground game finished fifth in the NFL as he was named to the Pro Bowl for the first time in his career. In 2018, Warford opened the first 15 games of the season and both postseason contests for the NFL's sixth ranked rushing offense and third-ranked scoring club, as he was named to the Pro Bowl for the second consecutive season.

C/G Will Clapp - A technically proficient player, who through the combination of size, strength and intelligence, was a three-year starter on the LSU offensive line, starting all 36 games that he appeared in (13 at center, 12 at left guard, 11 at right guard), earning first-team All-SEC honors at guard and center. Blocking for 1,000-yard rushers in each of his three college seasons, Clapp settled in at center in 2017, where he was a first-team All-SEC selection and a Rimington Trophy finalist. Clapp made his first career start at left guard in the 2018 regular season finale. After his first full offseason in the club's offseason strength and conditioning program, Clapp will provide depth on the interior of the Saints line and has also served as a jumbo tight end, seeing significant action as the club's sixth offensive lineman in Sunday's win at Chicago where the club rushed for 151 yards.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

DEFENSIVE DRAFTS

Over the last four NFL Drafts from 2015-18, New Orleans has shown a commitment to improving the defense, spending 17-of-28 picks on that side of the ball. With nine picks in the 2015 NFL Draft, the Saints picked six defensive players, the most taken since New Orleans chose nine defensive players in a 12-round selection meeting in 1990. Below is an overview of the players selected by New Orleans from 2015-19 on the 53-man roster:

S Vonn Bell, Ohio State (D2b-16) - Selected in the second round (61st overall) of the 2016 NFL Draft, Bell was a consensus All-American and one of the top rated defensive backs in the NFL Draft. As a senior, the Rossville, Ga. native was a Jim Thorpe Award semifinalist after recording 65 tackles and adding two interceptions, one brought back for a touchdown, a fumble recovery and 11 passes defended. Bell has translated that collegiate success to the NFL with ease in his first four seasons, appearing in 55 games with 39 starts and filling up the stat sheet with 309 tackles (209 solo), 6.5 sacks, 13 passes defended, seven forced fumbles and six fumble recoveries, one brought back for a touchdown. In the Week three and four contests, Bell became the first Saint to post three takeaways in two weeks since 2017, recovering three fumbles, including returning one 33 yards for a touchdown at Seattle, Sept. 22 and recovering two in the second quarter of a 12-10 win over Dallas on Sept. 29, to go with a club-best ten tackles, one pass defended and forcing one of the two fumbles that he recovered. He's posted 46 stops, four passes defended, two forced fumbles and four recoveries to tie for first in the NFL. Bell's four fumble recoveries are the most by a Saints defender since S Sammy Knight's five in 2001.

DE Marcus Davenport, Texas-San Antonio (D1-18) - Davenport joined the Saints with the 14th overall pick in the 2018 NFL Draft after showing potential and production as a pass rusher at Texas-San Antonio. In four seasons, Davenport posted 22 sacks, including 8.5 in 2017 when he captured Conference USA Defensive Player of the Year. Davenport's strength on the line is a valuable asset for the Saints front, playing an important role in the club's packages in 2018, recording 4.5 sacks. Davenport's tied for second on the club with three takedowns.

DB C.J. Gardner-Johnson, Florida (D4-19) - Possessing a combination of instincts and speed, this Cocoa, Florida native was a solid value in the fourth round for New Orleans after playing in all 13 games with 12 starts for the Gators in 2018, when he posted 71 tackles, three sacks and four interceptions with two brought back for touchdowns. He'll contribute to the club's multiple defensive

back packages. Gardner-Johnson received his first career NFL start as the club's nickelback on Sunday at Chicago and finished tied for second on the team with six solo tackles, posted a team-high two passes defended and added a stop on special teams

S Saquan Hampton, Rutgers (D6-19) - Selected in the sixth round of the 2019 NFL Draft out of Rutgers, the New Jersey native stayed home for college and played in 39 games with 27 starts in the Scarlet Knights secondary, as he posted career totals of 177 stops with five interceptions, 19 passes defended and one fumble recovery. He opened all 12 games at free safety for the Scarlet Knights in 2018 and earned team Most Valuable Player honors with 65 stops, three picks, 13 passes defended and one fumble recovery. Hampton made his NFL playing debut in Sunday's win at Chicago, contributing on defense and special teams.

DE Trey Hendrickson, Florida Atlantic (D3c-17) - This third round draft choice in the 2017 NFL Draft (103rd overall) out of Florida Atlantic brought his raw talent, size, strength and speed to a youthful Saints defensive line. After serving as a valuable backup his first two seasons, Hendrickson is tied for second on the team with three sacks.

CB Marshon Lattimore, Ohio State (D1a-17) - The 11th overall selection in the 2017 NFL draft and the first corner taken possesses all the traits of a lockdown defender. With his agile, fluid style, Lattimore has the ability to shut down the best wide receivers. He played a critical role in the pass defense unit as a rookie, as he moved into the lineup immediately. In October, he became the first Saints rookie since 2000 to capture NFL Defensive Rookie of the Month, when he had 16 tackles, two interceptions, one returned for a touchdown, five passes defended and a fumble recovery and also was honored in December. For the season, he finished with 53 stops, five picks, to lead NFL rookies and the Saints, tying a team rookie record, a club-best 18 passes defended, a forced fumble and a recovery. Lattimore was the first Saints corner selected to the Pro Bowl since 1995 and was selected as AP Defensive Rookie of the Year. His five takeaways (two interceptions and three fumble recoveries) in 2018 led the team, adding two more picks in the NFC Divisional Playoff win. In the Sept. 22 win at Seattle, Lattimore led New Orleans with a career-high 12 tackles (career-high ten solo). In the Sept. 29 win over Dallas, he covered Dallas WR Amari Cooper who managed only five receptions for 48 yards and in the Oct. 6 win vs. Tampa Bay, WR Mike Evans didn't manage a catch, adding a pick in the October 13 win at the Jacksonville Jaguars.

DT David Onyemata, Manitoba (D4-16) - Possessing a unique combination of size and speed, this Nigeria native had an impressive rookie year after becoming the first player from the University of Manitoba to be drafted into the NFL. Despite being new to football, the 2016 fourth round draft pick became a critical member on the interior of the Saints defensive front in 2017, playing in all 16 games with six starts, making 40 tackles and two sacks. Onyemata had a career-high 4.5 sacks in 2018, including a single-game career best three takedowns in last year's matchup with Dallas, adding another fourth quarter takedown against the Cowboys on Sept. 29. Onyemata has provided a punch for the Saints defense which is tied for sixth in the NFL, ranked ninth against the run, having started all six games he has played in and recording 17 stops and one sack.

DT Sheldon Rankins, Louisville (D1-16) - Selected 12th overall in the first round of the 2016 NFL Draft, the Georgia native played in 46 games along the line at Louisville from 2012-15, producing 133 total tackles, 31.5 tackles for loss and 18 sacks. In 2018, Rankins ranked second on the Saints with eight sacks, posting 42 stops and a forced fumble. Rankins ardently rehabilitated from a ruptured Achilles tendon suffered in the NFC Divisional Playoff and returned to the field for the team's 12-10 win over Dallas, where the Saints gave up only 45 yards rushing. He posted his first sack of the season in the October 6 win over Tampa Bay.

S Marcus Williams, Utah (D2-17) - A three-year starter at Utah, Williams was twice named All-Pac 12 and earned second-team All-American as a junior. In 2016, he tied for second in the conference with five interceptions. The defender boasts a dangerous mix of speed, fluidity, and instinct that allows him to read offenses and make breaks on the ball. His athleticism showed in his rookie season in as he made 70 tackles, four interceptions and six passes defended in 15 games, adding ten more stops (seven solo) and another pick in two postseason contests. He posted a key interception in the Sept. 9 season-opening win vs. Houston and ended the Sept. 29 win over Dallas with a pick. Williams forced a fumble and led the club with two special teams stops in Sunday's win at Chicago. Overall, he has played in all seven games with six starts, posting 24 tackles, the team-high two picks, six passes defended, the forced fumble and the two stops and coverage recorded Sunday.

FOURTH DOWN DEFENSE

In the Sept. 22 33-27 win at Seattle, the Saints allowed the Seahawks to convert on fourth down attempts only once in five tries, stopping them four times. This marked the first time the Saints stopped an opponent on fourth down four times since a 23-10 win at Jacksonville, October 2, 2011. In Sunday's win at Jacksonville, a fourth quarter fourth down stop at the New Orleans 40-yard line on fourth-and-two put New Orleans in the drivers seat.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

JUST KICKING IT

Between deep touchdown passes and athletic interceptions, players often use their hands to produce the game's flashiest plays. However, players who use their feet often make the difference between winning and losing, drilling clutch field goals or flipping the field with a well-executed punt.

K **Wil Lutz** went undrafted in 2016, joining Baltimore for training camp. Prior to the start of the regular season, Lutz joined the Black and Gold and immediately took on placekicking and kickoff duties. Lutz has kicked in 55 games, converting 102-of-118 field goal attempts (85.7 percent) and 163-of-169 PATs. He's also recorded 199 touchbacks on 317 career kickoffs. His 85.7 percent field goal percentage is best among kickers with at least 50 made field goals in team history. Until the 2018 regular season finale, he'd kicked a field goal in a club-record 36 consecutive games, second-longest streak in NFL history.

With his first field goal on Sunday at Chicago, Lutz set the NFL record for consecutive field goals on the road (35).

P **Thomas Morstead** was the first punter drafted by the Saints since 1984. The club's fifth round draft choice (164th overall) in 2009 from Southern Methodist University, Morstead has been a weapon in the field position game with his strong leg, outstanding placement abilities and booming kickoffs. In 11 seasons, he has a gross average of 46.8 on 600 punts with a 41.5 net and 217 punts inside the 20-yard line, while also booming 259 kickoffs in the end zone for touchbacks. Morstead is ranked 11th on the club's all-time games played list with 165 regular season appearances and his consistency carried over to the 2018 regular season, where he averaged a 46.4 gross punting average, a career-high and league-best 43.2 net punting average, with 15 dropped inside-the-20-yard line. In 2019, he's ranked second with punts inside the 20-yard line (19).

SWISS ARMY KNIFE

New Orleans QB **Taysom Hill**, in his third year with the club, has brought unheralded versatility to the Saints on both offense and special teams. A participant on every special teams unit except field goal and PAT, as well as a signal-caller, runner and receiver on offense, In the 2018 regular season, Hill averaged 24.9 yards per return on 14 kickoff returns, had six coverage stops to rank second on the team, completed a ten-yard pass on a fake punt in Week Four and blocked a punt on December 9 at Tampa Bay. Overall in 2018, Hill carried 37 times for 196 yards (5.3 avg.), ranked third on the team with two touchdowns and completed three of seven passes for 64 yards. The blocked punt against the Buccaneers earned him Week 14 NFC Special Teams Player of the Week honors. In the 2018 postseason, he caught a touchdown, made a special teams tackle and executed a successful fake punt. In 2019, Hill has appeared in every contest, carrying 12 times for 82 yards and catching five passes for 34 yards with two touchdowns.

COVERAGE/BLOCK UNITS

New Orleans' coverage units have been led the past two seasons by linebacker **Craig Robertson**, Hill and defensive back **Justin Hardee Sr.** Hardee led the team with nine stops and a blocked punt recovered for a touchdown as a rookie in 2017. In 2018, Hardee led the team in the regular season with a career-high ten stops, with Hill ranked second with six stops. Robertson also made a big play in the November 4 win over Los Angeles when he stopped rams holder Johnny Hecker short of the first down marker on a fake field goal attempt. He did the same December 23 vs. Pittsburgh in a crucial fourth quarter situation to snuff out a fake punt attempt. New Orleans' punt coverage unit finished the regular season ranked third in the National Football League, surrendering only 5.0 yards per return. The 60 punt return yards given up by the coverage units were the lowest in club record books, the lowest total in the NFL in 2018 and the fifth-lowest total since the 16-game schedule started in 1978.

Rookie wide receiver/return specialist **Deonte Harris** has made an impact on New Orleans' return game. Harris was signed following the NFL Draft out of Assumption, where he finished his career as one of the most prolific returners in NCAA history. In the final game of his college career, he set the NCAA-All Division record for career combined return touchdowns (14).

In 2019, Harris has brought back 20 punts for 196 yards (10.0 avg.), ranking sixth in the NFL in punt return average, first among rookies, following a 53-yard runback for a touchdown in the first quarter of the Sept. 22 33-27 win at Seattle. Harris has also returned nine kickoffs for 200 yards (22.2 avg.), to ranked ninth in the league in kickoff return average and has recorded one special teams stop

QUARTERBACKS

TEDDY BRIDGEWATER

- With Drew Brees sidelined following thumb surgery, sixth-year veteran Teddy Bridgewater has taken over the reigns of the offense. Bridgewater began his NFL career with the Minnesota Vikings as the 32nd pick in the 2014 NFL Draft. He moved into the starters role in Week Four of his rookie season and went on to be selected the Pepsi NFL Rookie of the Year, leading the Vikings to the NFC North title the following season with a Pro Bowl selection. Overall, he has played in 41 games with 34 starts, completing 697-of-1,069 passes for 7,638 yards with 38 touchdowns, 25 interceptions and an 88.3 passer rating. Bridgewater has also carried 125 times for 45 yards with four touchdowns. In 34 career starts, Bridgewater has posted a 22-12 career record in the regular season.

- With starter Brees sidelined following thumb surgery, the Miami native has played in six games with five starts, completing 132-of-195 attempts (67.7%) for 1,370 yards with nine touchdowns, two interceptions and a 98.9 passer rating, while carrying 20 times for 39 yards and winning all five starts.

- Bridgewater received his first start of 2019 on Sept. 22 at Seattle and completed 19-of-27 passes for 177 yards with touchdown passes to Alvin Kamara and Michael Thomas, zero interceptions and a 112.7 passer rating. He also carried three times for 12 yards in the 33-27 victory. It was Bridgewater's first win since the 2015 regular season finale.

- Bridgewater quarterbacked New Orleans to its second consecutive win on Sept. 29 vs. Dallas, completing 23-of-30 passes for 193 yards and engineering a 15-play, 67-yard drive that spanned 9:06 and ran into the fourth quarter, resulting in a go ahead field goal in rebounding from a 10-9 deficit, completing three-of-four passes for 22 yards. It was his first fourth quarter game-winning drive since a 21-18 win vs. The St. Louis Rams on Nov. 8, 2015.

- Bridgewater earned his 20th career victory as a starter and third straight in a 31-24 win over Tampa Bay, Oct. 6, finishing 26-of-34 for 314 yards, four touchdowns, one interception and a 131.2 rating, the second-highest of his career. It was the second four-touchdown game of Bridgewater's career as he passed for over 300 yards for the sixth time. Bridgewater's 42-yard completion to Michael Thomas on the first play of the third quarter is his longest completion as a Saint. Joined Billy Kilmer (1969) and Brees as only the third Saints signal caller with 300 yards passing and four touchdown passes in the same contest.

- Bridgewater earned his 21st career victory as a starter and fourth straight in a 13-6 win at Jacksonville Sunday. He completed 24-of-36 (66.7%) of his passes for 240 yards, one touchdown, zero interceptions and a 94.7 passer rating. Bridgewater engineered a game-winning drive that spanned the third and fourth quarters and ended with a four-yard touchdown pass to TE Jared Cook to put New Orleans up 13-6.

- Bridgewater earned his 22nd career win as a starter and won five straight starts for the second time in franchise history, completing 23-of-38 passes for 281 yards, two touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 100.9 passer rating in a 36-25 win at Chicago.

DREW BREES

- Since first signing with New Orleans in 2006 and starting all 205 regular season games, a club record, Brees leads the NFL with 62,497 passing yards, 442 touchdown passes, 8,022 attempts, 5,496 completions, a 68.5% completion percentage, 109 games with at least 300 yards passing, 16 with at least 400, 481 completions of 25 yards or more and stands at third in the league with a 100.6 rating.

- Since signing with the Saints as an unrestricted free agent in 2006 from San Diego, Brees threw for 4,000 or more yards in his first 12 seasons with the club before sitting out the 2018 regular season finale at 3,992 and became the only NFL signal-caller to throw for 5,000 yards five different times and ranked at or near the top in every passing category.

- Brees enjoyed another standout campaign in 2018, completing 364-of-489 passes (74.4%) for 3,992 yards with 32 touchdowns, only five interceptions and a 115.7 rating. Brees finished first in the NFL with his league-record completion percentage, career-high passer rating, second in fourth quarter passer rating (118.9), third in third down passer rating (108.8) while setting the league's all-time records in both completions and passing yardage and moving into second place in Week 10 in scoring throws. He was selected as the Pro Bowl starter and as an AP All-Pro

- Prior to suffering a right thumb injury which required surgery, Brees had started two games in 2019, completing 35-of-48 passes (72.9%) for 408 yards with two touchdowns, two interceptions and a 94.8 passer rating.

- Brees has been selected to play in a team-record 11 Pro Bowls as a member of the Saints, with 12 overall berths in the National Football League's all-star game, three times as a starter, including his most recent selection in 2018. His seven consecutive selections (2008-14) as a Saint is tied for first in club history with Pro Football Hall of Fame tackle William Roaf.

- Brees has posted a 126-79 regular season mark in games he has started since signing with the Saints in 2006. In Week 15 of the 2016 season, Brees earned his 100th regular season victory in a Saints uniform. Including his seven playoff victories, his 134 total wins as a member of the Saints make him the winningest quarterback in team history and the NFL's second-winningest signal-caller since 2006.

- In his 19-year NFL playing career during which he has appeared in 265 regular season games with 264 starts, ranked sixth in league record books for signal-callers, Brees has completed 6,621-of-9,831 passes (67.3%) for 74,845 yards, 522 touchdown passes and a 97.7 passer rating. He's stands as the NFL's all-time most accurate passer, became the league's recordholder in completions on Sept. 23, 2018, the passing yardage leader on Oct. 8, 2018 is ranked second in touchdowns and third in passer rating.

LATAVIUS MURRAY

- Originally a sixth round pick of the Oakland Raiders in 2013 out of Central Florida, the versatile back brings a bruising style to the Black and Gold to complement Kamara. Signed as an unrestricted free agent from Minnesota in the offseason, Murray has appeared in 84 games with 50 starts for the Raiders, Vikings and Saints, carrying 958 times for 3,955 yards (4.1 avg.) with 37 touchdowns and catching 142 passes for 981 yards. Murray's 29 rushing touchdowns since the 2016 season rank fourth in the NFL.

- In 2018, Murray played in all 16 games with six starts for the Vikings and carried 140 times for 578 yards (4.1 avg.) with a club-best six touchdowns and added 22 receptions for 141 yards.

- In his first season in New Orleans, Murray's played in all seven games with two starts, carrying 59 times for 257 yards (4.4 avg.) with a club-best three touchdowns and has caught 14 passes for 98 yards.

TED GINN JR.

• Ginn joined the Saints in the 2017 offseason as an unrestricted free agent in his 11th National Football League season. He has been a member of five teams since being selected with the ninth overall pick in the 2007 NFL Draft by the Miami Dolphins out of Ohio State, and has appeared in 178 games with 79 starts over that period. In his long career marked by big play ability, he has accumulated 5,535 receiving yards off 397 catches (13.9 avg.), recording 32 touchdowns. In his first season in New Orleans, Ginn played in 15 games with ten starts and recorded 53 grabs for 787 yards with four touchdown receptions, carried ten times for 39 yards and brought back 19 punts for 103 yards and five kickoffs for 56 yards. Ginn finished ranked second on the Saints in receiving yardage among the team’s wideouts. He also enjoyed his most productive postseason as a professional, opening both playoff contests and making 12 grabs for 187 yards with an 80-yard touchdown and adding one carry for 11 yards.

• After spending the bulk of the 2018 campaign on Injured Reserve with a knee injury, Ginn returned with a vengeance in the 2019 opening win over Houston, posting seven receptions for 101 yards, including a 41-yard grab and has 18 grabs for 254 yards (14.1 avg.) and one touchdown with two carries for 13 yards in seven contests with five starts as he surpassed 6,000 career total yards from scrimmage with his 45-yard grab in Sunday’s win at Chicago to set up a score, the longest play from scrimmage by New Orleans this season.

TIGHT ENDS

JARED COOK

• This veteran tight end enters his 11th NFL season and first with the Black and Gold after signing as an unrestricted free agent from the Oakland Raiders. The former University of South Carolina standout who originally entered the league as a third round draft pick of the Tennessee Titans in 2009 has career totals of 440 receptions for 5,632 yards (12.8 avg.) with 27 touchdowns in 155 games with 81 starts. Through the first six contests of 2019 with four starts, Cook has posted 15 receptions for 168 yards (11.2 avg.) and two touchdowns.

• In his final season in Oakland in 2018, Cook appeared in all 16 games with 14 starts and finished with career-highs and the team lead in receptions (68), receiving yards (896) and receiving TDs (six) as he was named to his first Pro Bowl. He finished fifth among NFL tight ends in receptions and receiving touchdowns. In six games with four starts in 2019, he’s posted 15 grabs for 168 yards and two touchdowns.

JOSH HILL

• This Idaho State product made the club as an undrafted free agent in 2013 and his consistency has been an asset to the position group for who he’s played in 94 games with 47 starts, making 95 receptions for 920 yards and 12 touchdowns, also chipping in 27 special teams tackles. In 2019, Hill has played in all seven games with four starts and has 12 receptions for 121 yards with one touchdown, five grabs off from his receiving high. He stepped up in Cook’s absence in Sunday’s win at Chicago, posting three receptions for 43 yards (14.3 avg.) with a seven-yard touchdown in the third quarter.

DEFENSIVE ENDS

CAMERON JORDAN

• New Orleans' first choice in the 2011 NFL Draft (24th overall) out of the California, Jordan enjoyed another standout season in 2018, recording 48 tackles (37 solo), a team-leading 12 sacks, six passes defended, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery as he was selected to his fourth Pro Bowl and a second-team *Associated Press* All-Pro selection. With 78.5 sacks in nine seasons, Jordan's ranked third on the Saints career sack list. Jordan's also proven to be one of the NFL's best run defenders, as well as being known for generating pressure on quarterbacks that doesn't always show up on the stat sheet, with him playing a lead role in a run defense ranked second in the NFL in opponent rushing yards per game and in opponent yards per rush in 2018 and being tied for sixth in overall defense and ninth against the run in 2019. In 2019, Jordan has posted 22 tackles (17 solo), seven sacks for a 51-yard loss, to be tied for fourth in the NFL in takedowns and one fumble recovery.

MARCUS DAVENPORT

- Trading up to the 14th spot in the 2018 NFL Draft, the Saints addressed the line and the pass rush with this gifted pass rusher, only the second draft choice ever from Texas-San Antonio. During four college seasons, Davenport notched totals of 186 tackles (97 solo), 22 sacks, 38 tackles for loss, six forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries, one returned for a touchdown and eight passes defended, finishing his career as the school's all-time leader for stops for loss, takedowns and quarterback hurries (21). In 13 games as a rookie, Davenport posted 22 tackles (12 solo), four sacks, two passes defended and one forced fumble. He is tied for second on the team with three takedowns, needing two more tackles to surpass his 2018 total through only seven games, to go with one forced fumble.

TREY HENDRICKSON

- Selected by the Saints in the third round of the 2017 NFL Draft, Hendrickson came to the Saints from Florida Atlantic, where he departed the school with a team-record 29.5 career sacks. Hendrickson has appeared in 20 games in three seasons, recording 32 tackles (20 solo), five sacks, two passes defended and two forced fumbles. Following an offseason, where he made significant strides in the weight room and with technique, Hendrickson's hard work paid off with two sacks in the Sept. 9 season-opening win over Houston followed up by a takedown/forced fumble in Week Two at the Los Angeles Rams. In his breakthrough campaign, he has 11 tackles, three sacks and the forced fumble.

CARL GRANDERSON

- Signed by New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Wyoming, Granderson has seen action in three contests on special teams and defense, recording his first sack vs. Tampa Bay, Oct. 6. Granderson posted 17.5 career sacks in college and possesses the perfect body type for a pass rusher.

DEFENSIVE TACKLES

MALCOM BROWN

- This former first round draft pick was a vital part of a Patriots defensive line that helped pick up two Super Bowl championships in the last three seasons. The University of Texas product has been a run-stopping force in the New England defensive line for the past four seasons and now with New Orleans, playing in 67 games with 58 starts and recording 203 tackles, ten sacks, one forced fumble and three fumble recoveries. Now Brown will look to supplement a Saints defense that finished 2018 second in run defense, posting two sacks in seven contests as well.

SHELDON RANKINS

- The third defensive lineman selected in the 2016 NFL Draft out of Louisville, Sheldon Rankins started all 16 games in 2017 posting 26 tackles (16 solo), two sacks for loss of 13 yards, one interception, one pass defended and one forced fumble. He helped a defensive unit that went from 31st in the NFL, allowing 28.4 points per game in 2016 to allowing 20.4 points per game in 2017, good for tenth in the league. In his first full season after missing seven contests as a rookie, Rankins' ability to rush the passer from the inside as well as take on double teams proved beneficial in 2017 helping the defense post 42 sacks, ranking seventh in the league, compared to only 30 takedowns in 2016. In 2018, Rankins had a career-high 40 tackles (26 solo), a forced fumble and a career-best eight sacks to rank second on the club and fifth in the National Football League among defensive tackles.

DAVID ONYEMATA

- A fourth round selection out of Manitoba in 2016, Onyemata has teamed with Brown and Rankins to form a solid front in the interior. In 54 games with 16 starts, he's posted 125 career tackles, 7.5 sacks, two passes defended and one forced fumble. In 16 games with four starts in 2018, Onyemata posted 36 tackles, in helping with a run defense

ranked second in the NFL. On Nov. 29 vs. Dallas, he enjoyed a breakout performance with career-highs in tackles (seven), sacks (three) and forced fumbles (one). In 2019, he's opened all six games, he's played in, posting 17 stops for the NFL's ninth-ranked run defense.

LINEBACKERS

DEMARIO DAVIS

- This dependable and sure-tackling defender joined the Saints after a breakout 2017, where he started 16 games for the Jets. Davis posted a team-high and career-high 165 tackles (112 solo), a career-best five sacks, three passes defended and a fumble recovery. For his career, the Brandon, Miss. native has appeared in 119 games with 105 starts for the Jets (2012-15, 2017), Cleveland (2016) and Saints, recording 815 tackles (538 solo), 18.5 sacks, an interception, 23 passes defended, three forced fumbles, five fumble recoveries and 24 special team stops.

- In 2018, Davis opened all 16 regular season contests at the weakside position and led the team with 110 stops (74 solo), five sacks to lead the linebacker corps, four passes defended, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. Davis' abilities to diagnose and tackle played a key role in New Orleans ranking second in the NFL in opponent rushing yards per game and opponent rushing yards per play. Participating in the postseason for the first time, Davis led the defense with 22 stops (15 solo), an interception in the NFC Championship and a pass defense. In 2019, he has posted 45 stops, ranked second on the club.

A.J. KLEIN

- Signed as an unrestricted free agent from Carolina in 2017, where he spent his first four seasons, Klein's played a significant role in the linebacker rotation. Opening 12 games on the strongside in his first season with the club, Klein had 54 tackles (37 solo), two sacks, five passes defended and one forced fumble. In 16 contests with 15 starts in 2018, he posted a career-high 70 tackles (42 solo), one interception, two sacks, three passes defended and two fumble recoveries, playing a key role in a run defense ranked second in the NFL in opponent yards per rush and opponent rushing yards per game.

- Klein's started all seven games in 209, ranking among team leaders with 35 stops (25 solo) and a fumble recovery on Sunday at Chicago.

CRAIG ROBERTSON

• In just his first year with the Saints, Robertson quickly became one of the most important members of the young defense. After four seasons with Cleveland, Robertson joined the Saints looking to contribute on defense and special teams, yet his production outpaced even the highest expectations. Starting 15 games, Robertson led the Saints with 131 tackles (100 solo), while adding a sack, four passes defended, and interception, and two fumble recoveries. In 2017 in 16 games with starts in the last 12 contests, he had 77 stops (50 solo) to rank second on the team, two sacks to lead the linebackers, two interceptions to also lead his position group, six passes defended, the forced fumble/fumble recovery and a special teams fumble recovery. In 2018, he served as a special teams captain, playing in every contest and posting 14 defensive and special teams stops and one sack, as the Black and Gold surrendered a league-low 60 punt return yards. Robertson, who has 535 career defensive stops, provides valuable depth at all three linebacker positions and outstanding leadership to the defense and special teams units.

• In 2019, Lattimore has 34 stops, one interception and a team-high nine passes defended, during a standout campaign where he has blanketed elite receivers.

OUT OF THE MARSH

Below are several of Marshon Lattimore's 2019 defensive highlights.

In a 33-27 win at Seattle, Dec. 22, Lattimore posted a career-high 12 tackles (career-high ten solo) and one pass defended.

In the Sept. 29 win vs. Dallas, Lattimore was assigned to standout wideout Amari Cooper and held him to five catches for 48 yards, while he also drew two offensive pass interference penalties.

In the Oct. 6 win vs. Tampa Bay, Lattimore was assigned to wideout Mike Evans, who did not record one reception, while Lattimore posted two passes defended.

In the Oct. 13 win at Jacksonville, Lattimore recorded his first pick of the season and three passes defended as Jaguars wide receiver D.J. Chark was held to three receptions for 43 yards.

CORNERBACKS

MARSHON LATTIMORE

• Selected by the Saints in the first round (11th overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft, Lattimore started all 13 games he appeared in. He totaled 53 tackles (44 solo), a forced fumble, one fumble recovery, five interceptions for 85 yards and 18 passes defended, as he became the youngest Saint (21 years old) ever selected to the Pro Bowl and was selected as the AP NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year.

• In 2018, Lattimore opened all 16 regular season contests and posted 59 tackles (49 solo), two interceptions, 12 passes defended, a club-best four forced fumbles, which was tied for fourth in the NFL and three fumble recoveries, returned for 91 yards, leading the team in takeaways and tied for the NFL lead in defensive fumble recoveries, the highest total among defensive backs. Lattimore also added two picks in the NFC Divisional Playoff win over Philadelphia.

ELI APPLE

• The tenth overall pick of the New York Giants in the 2016 NFL Draft out of Ohio State and a former teammate in the Buckeyes defensive backfield with Lattimore and Vonn Bell, since being acquired by New Orleans, Bell has made a positive impact in the Saints secondary. In the 12 regular season and postseason games Apple started, the Black and Gold surrendered 20 or fewer points eight times with six consecutive contests of giving up 17 or fewer points and he picked up two interceptions, including one in the end zone at the end of the first half of the December 17 win at Carolina and a fumble recovery. Further progression is expected from Apple in 2019 after his first full offseason with the Black and Gold with his first big play coming with a forced fumble in the September 22 win at Seattle.

SAFETIES

NOSE FOR THE BALL

MARCUS WILLIAMS

- After being selected in the second round of the 2017 NFL Draft (42nd overall) out of Utah, this ball-hawking safety had an excellent rookie campaign starting all 15 games he appeared in posting 70 tackles (56 solo), four interceptions and six passes defended. Williams led rookie safeties in interceptions and was second in tackles and passes defended, including two picks in the regular season finale. He also posted his first career postseason interception, which was the only pick made by a rookie in the playoffs. Williams built on an impressive rookie season as one of the centerpieces of one of the National Football League’s youngest defensive backfields, tying for the club lead with two picks in 2018 and with a fumble recovery on Thanksgiving night vs. Atlanta.

- Williams has opened 2019 in impressive fashion, recording a key third quarter pick in the Monday night win over Houston and posting a pick at the end of the Sept. 29 win vs. Dallas. Following a forced fumble, four tackles and two special teams stops in Sunday’s win at Chicago, Williams has posted 23 stops, the two picks, six passes defended, the forced fumble and the two coverage stops.

VONN BELL

- Bell left onlookers impressed with his 2016 rookie campaign. Playing in every game with 14 starts, he totaled 98 tackles (59 solo), second on the team, four passes defended, a sack, two forced fumbles, and a fumble recovery. Selected in the second round of the 2016 NFL Draft (61st overall), Bell was a consensus first-team All-American as a junior at Ohio State. In 2017, he played in all 16 games with ten starts and posted a team-high 78 tackles (57 solo), 4.5 sacks, tied for second on the club and lead defensive backs, two passes defended, two forced fumbles and five special teams stops. He led the Saints with 17 postseason stops and added a key takedown late in the NFC Wild Card Playoff win vs. Carolina. In 2018, he led the secondary with 87 tackles (61 solo), one sack, three passes defended, one forced fumble and a fumble recovery on Thanksgiving night vs. Atlanta.

- Bell is ranked first on the team with 46 tackles and has a club-best four fumble recoveries, which is tied for first in the National Football League and the most by a Saint since safety Sammy Knight’s five in 2001.
