**THE MATCHUP**

After going 2-2 for the first four games of the 2023 season, the New Orleans Saints go on the road for two consecutive contests, starting with taking on the New England Patriots Sunday at Gillette Stadium in Foxboro, Mass.

It is the 16th contest all-time between the two clubs, with New England holding a 10-5 advantage, the Patriots leading 5-4 at home. The Saints and Patriots have split the last two meetings, each winning at the opponent's home stadium. For New Orleans, they posted their first victory against New England at Gillette Stadium, a 28-13 win on Sept. 26, 2021.

The next two road games serve as the midpoint of a stretch for the first eight contests of the season where the Saints play five away from the Caesars Superdome. Since 2018, New Orleans' 30-13 road mark is ranked first in the NFC and second in the NFL. New Orleans will be looking to remove the bad taste in their mouths associated with a 26-9 home loss to the Tampa Bay Buccaneers on Sunday.

Offensively, New Orleans takes the task of improving their overall efficiency and re-integrating five-time Pro Bowl running back **Alvin Kamara** into the offensive attack. Kamara made his 2023 debut on Sunday, carrying 11 times for 51 yards (4.6 avg.) and also caught 13 passes, tied for the second-highest total of his seven-year career.

Wide receiver **Michael Thomas**, rounding into form after missing the last 14 contests of 2022 with a toe injury, showed explosion, averaging 13.3 yards per catch, totaling 53 receiving yards on four receptions.

On defense, New Orleans allowed only 3.5 yards per carry on the ground, uncharacteristically allowing Tampa Bay to convert 8-of-15 third down attempts (53.3%), while both of the Buccaneers' red zone trips ended with touchdowns. Cornerback **Isaac Yiadom** recorded his first interception as a Saint near the end of the second half and rookie defensive tackle **Bryan Bresee** finished with four tackles, including one sack and three stops for loss. Defensive lineman **Malcolm Roach** and linebacker **Pete Werner** tied for the team lead with eight tackles.

Special teams continued to be a bright spot for New Orleans in keeping the contest close. Rookie kicker **Blake Grupe** drilled all three field goal attempts and rookie punter **Lou Hedley** had a career-high three punts drop inside-the-20-yard line. Second-year wide receiver/return specialist **Rashid Shaheed** returned two punts for 45 yards, including a 29-yard runback and caught three passes for 33 yards. Shaheed currently leads the NFL with a 23.8 punt return average and ranks second with 567 all-purpose yards.

New England comes off a 38-3 loss at the Dallas Cowboys on Sunday.

THE COACHES

Dennis Allen was hired as the 17th head coach in New Orleans Saints history on February 8, 2022. Now in his 28th year coaching and 21st in the NFL, Allen has spent 13 seasons in New Orleans in two separate stints, including the six-and-a-half campaigns (2015-21) as the team's defensive coordinator prior to being promoted to head coach. He succeeded Sean Payton, who coached the team for 16 seasons, including the 2009 campaign, when Allen was secondary coach and ended with the Super Bowl XLIV championship. When Allen took control of a Black and Gold defense in Week 11 of the 2015 season that was ranked 32nd both in opponent net yards per game and opponent points per game, he methodically molded a unit that has finished in the top 10 in both categories each of the last three years. From 2017 to the present, New Orleans is the only defense in the NFL to rank in the top five in the National Football League in both opponent rushing yards per game and sacks.

In his first year as head coach of the Saints, Allen guided New Orleans through the challenge of significant injuries at several positions to win three of their last four games after a Week 14 bye and give up 20 or fewer points in the final eight contests of the season, ten points apiece in the final three. Carrying over to the 2023 season, where New Orleans has started 2-2, the Saints had surrendered 20 or fewer points in a franchise-record 11 consecutive games until this past Sunday.

Before rejoining the Saints coaching staff in 2015, Allen served as head coach of the Oakland Raiders from 2012-14 and as defensive coordinator of the Denver Broncos in 2011. Prior to his first stint in New Orleans from 2006-10, Allen was also an assistant with the Atlanta Falcons from 2002-05, where he received his NFL coaching start.

Over the course of his coaching career in New Orleans, Allen has coached linebacker Demario Davis and defensive end Cameron Jordan to career seasons. Davis has led the team in tackles in every campaign since signing with the club as an unrestricted free agent in 2018 and has garnered AP All-Pro honors four straight times. Since Allen returned to New Orleans in 2015, his 86.5 sacks rank third in the NFL.

Allen played safety at Texas A&M from 1992-95, where he started the final 21 games of his college career before being signed as an undrafted free agent by the Buffalo Bills in 1996. Prior to entering the National Football League coaching ranks in 2002, Allen served as a graduate assistant at his alma mater from 1996-99 and as secondary coach at the University of Tulsa from 2000-2001. He earned a bachelor of business administration degree and a master's in kinesiology from Texas A&M.

Raised in Hurst, Texas, Allen and his wife, Alisson, have

a daughter, Layla and a son, Garrison.

Bill Belichick is in his 47th season as an NFL coach and his 24th season as head coach of the Patriots. Belichick led the Patriots to 19 consecutive winning seasons (2001-19). The only other NFL coach to have at least 10 consecutive winning seasons with one team since the 1970 merger was Tom Landry, who led the Cowboys to 16 consecutive winning seasons (1970-1985). Through 23 seasons with New England, Belichick has delivered six Super Bowl championships, nine conference titles, 17 division crowns and 30 playoff wins in 18 playoff seasons, while posting an overall record of 293-123. Belichick won his sixth Super Bowl title as a head coach in 2018 with the Patriots' 13-3 victory over the Los Angeles Rams. He joined George Halas and Curly Lambeau as the only coaches with six NFL Championships and owns the record for the most Super Bowl titles, two ahead of Pittsburgh's Chuck Noll. Belichick is the only of those five to win three titles in a four-year span with Super Bowl wins in 2001 and back-to-back Super Bowl wins in 2003 and 2004. With the victory over Indianapolis in the 2014 AFC Championship, he collected his 21st career postseason win, the most postseason wins by a head coach. He expanded on that record and now has 31 postseason victories. The 2018 AFC Championship was Belichick's ninth conference championship as a head coach, adding to his mark as the most in NFL history. New England's berth in Super Bowl LII was Belichick's 12th Super Bowl during his coaching career, the most among any individual who became a head coach in NFL history. Belichick has recorded 311 career wins (regular season and postseason), which is third all-time in NFL history. He owns a career winning percentage of .678, second all-time, behind George Halas (.682). Belichick directed the Patriots to victories in Super Bowls XXXVI (2001), XXXVIII (2003), XXXIX (2004), XLIX (2014) and LI (2016) and LIII (2018), and in 2007 he became the first NFL head coach to guide his team to a 16-0 regular season. His 17 division titles are the most among any coach. He also is the first NFL head coach to lead his team to 11 straight division crowns (2009-19). Belichick helped the Patriots become the first franchise in NFL history to score 500--or-more points in four seasons (2007-589, 2010-518, 2011-513 and 2012-557). The Rams are the only other team to have done it three times, while Belichick is the only head coach in NFL history to lead a team to three-straight 500-point seasons. Belichick is the only head coach in NFL history to win at least 14 regular-season games in five separate seasons. Only five other coaches -- George Seifert (3), Joe Gibbs (2), Mike Ditka (2), Andy Reid (3) and Don Shula (2) -- have more than one 14-win season. Belichick's Patriots teams own the all-time NFL records for consecutive victories, including the postseason (21 from 2003-04) and consecutive playoff victories (10 from 2001-05). Over a 100-game span from 2003-09, he directed the Patriots to an 81 wins -- the most in NFL history by a head coach. Belichick's recent accomplishments are the latest triumphs in a career during which he has helped produce eight Super Bowl titles, 12 conference championships and 24 division titles since entering the NFL in 1975. He won his first two Super Bowls as defensive coordinator for the New York Giants in 1986 and 1990. Seifert is the only other man to have won multiple Super Bowls both as a head coach and as an assistant coach. **CONTINUED ON NEXT PAGE**

Belichick launched his coaching career in 1975 with the Baltimore Colts and continued as an assistant with Detroit (1976-77), Denver (1978) and the Giants (1979-1990). Belichick was named head coach of the Cleveland Browns in 1991, becoming the youngest head coach in the NFL at age 38. By 1994, under Belichick the Browns finished 11-5 and advanced to the second round of the playoffs, while allowing a league-low 204 total points. In 1996, Belichick joined New England and was a key contributor to the Patriots first division title in 10 years en route to the Patriots appearance in Super Bowl XXXI. Belichick then spent three seasons with the New York Jets (1997-99), helping New York improve from a 1-15 season in 1996 to an appearance in the AFC Championship Game in 1998.

SERIES HISTORY

New England dominated the series in early years, with a stretch where the Patriots won the first five games between the two clubs and currently leads the series 10-5. New Orleans posted three-straight victories from 1989-95 – all on the road. The Saints broke a three-game losing streak with a 38-17 win over the Patriots on Monday, November 30, 2009, when they improved their record to 11-0

Eight of the 15 games have been decided by a touchdown or less - including two by a field goal. The Saints have a 4-5 record in Foxboro, having broken a three

game losing streak with a 28-13 win on Sept. 26, 2021, their first victory in Gillette Stadium. A view of the results:

Williams - Father, Doug, is a veteran of Washington's front office, who won Super Bowl XXII as their starting quarterback, the pinnacle of a storied 12-year pro football career, which includes him being in the Buccaneers Ring of Honor, also working in the Tampa Bay front office.

Offensive Assistant **Jahri Evans** - Evans was selected by the Saints in the fourth round (108th overall) of the 2006 NFL Draft and spent the first 11 seasons of his 12-year playing career with the Saints. Overall, he started 183 career regular season games at right guard for the Saints (2006-16) and Green Bay Packers (2017), 169 for the Black and Gold. Evans was a six-time Pro Bowl selection, a five-time *Associated Press* All-Pro and was named to the Pro Football Hall of Fame's 2020's All-Decade Team, as New Orleans finished in the Top Ten in total offense each of the 11 seasons he lined up for the Saints, while the 196 sacks surrendered by the offensive line over the period were the lowest in the NFC and second-lowest in the NFL. After being selected as a consensus All-Rookie in 2006, Evans was a Pro Bowl starter and consensus first-team All-Pro each season from 2009-12. He was inducted into the Saints Hall of Fame in 2020, the Louisiana Sports Hall of Fame in 2022 and was a semifinalist for the Pro Football Hall of Fame's Class of 2023.

Defensive Assistant **Matt Giordano** - Giordano was a fourth round draft pick of the Indianapolis Colts in 2005 and enjoyed a nine-year NFL career with the Colts (2005-08), Green Bay Packers (2009), Saints (2010), Oakland Raiders (2011-12) and St. Louis Rams (2013), starting 30-of-116 career games, accumulating 202 tackles, one sack, 11 interceptions, including two returned for touchdowns, 16 passes defensed, two forced fumbles, 52 special teams stop and one coverage fumble recovery. He also appeared in seven postseason games for the Colts and Packers and was a member of Indianapolis' Super Bowl XLI championship team.

Secondary Coach **Marcus Robertson** - Robertson played in the NFL for 12 years with the Houston Oilers/Tennessee Titans (1991-00) and the Seattle Seahawks (2001-02) after entering the league with Houston as a fourth-round selection (102nd overall) in the 1991 NFL Draft out of Iowa State. Robertson was a first-team All-Pro at free safety in 1993 and 1997. The Pasadena, Calif. native finished his career by appearing in 162 games (144 starts), collecting 24 interceptions, 72 passes defensed, 11 fumble recoveries, nine forced fumbles and 795 tackles (638 solo).

Pass Rush Specialist **Brian Young** - Played in the National Football League from 2000-08 with the St. Louis Rams his first four seasons, who originally selected him in the fifth round of the 2000 NFL Draft (139th overall) from Texas-El Paso and final five campaigns with the Saints, playing in 124 games, recording 22.5 career sacks and eight fumble recoveries.

BUCKING THE ODDS

The Saints have a long tradition of finding players as free agents signed after the draft that make an impact immediately or developing their careers initially on the team's practice squad. Several undrafted Saints on the roster play key roles on offense, defense and special teams that the club developed.

Wide receiver/return specialist **Rashid Shaheed** came to New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Weber State in 2022 after being one of the all-time best Division FCS returners and after spending the first five weeks on the practice squad, made an immediate impact, becoming the only Saint to score a touchdown in each of his first two offensive touches. In the December 18 win over Atlanta, he finished with three receptions for 95 yards, with a 68-yard touchdown grab from Taysom Hill, the longest play from scrimmage of the season for New Orleans and the fifth-longest receiving TD by a Saints rookie all-time. On the Christmas Eve win at Cleveland in challenging conditions, Shaheed led the team in receiving with four grabs for 41 yards. In the January 1 victory at Philadelphia, he led the team in receiving for the third consecutive week, posting six receptions for 79 yards, including a 58-yard grab to set up a field goal. Overall, he carried four times for 57 yards with a 44-yard touchdown, caught 28 passes for 488 yards (17.4 avg.) with two TDs, returned 20 punts for 193 yards (9.7 avg.) and returned 14 kickoffs for 320 yards (22.9 avg.). **CONTINUED ON NEXT PAGE**

In 2023, Shaheed is no longer a secret, as he has caught 12 passes for 185 yards (club-best 15.4 avg.) with one touchdown, including grabs of 41- and 45 yards, while also carrying three times for 11 yards and ranking first in the NFL in punt return average (23.8) and second in all purpose yards (567). On Sept. 24 in Green Bay, he had his first career punt return for a touchdown, the second-longest scoring return in franchise history (76 yards). This past Sunday vs. Tampa Bay, Shaheed had a 29-yard return, making him the first Saint to have a return of at least 25 yards in back to back contests since Darren Sproles (9/25-10/2/11). With a return of at least 25 yards on Sunday in New England, Shaheed would become the first Saints to do so in three straight contests since Michael Lewis (12/12-12/26/04).

Tight end **Juwan Johnson** led his position group with four touchdown receptions in 2021, converting to the position after playing wide receiver in college and starting his Black

and Gold career in 2020 as a wideout on the team's practice squad after signing as an undrafted free agent from Oregon. In 2022, he led his position group in receiving with 42 grabs for 508 yards with a club-best and career-high seven receiving touchdowns, tied for third at the position in the National Football League. On January 1, 2023 at Philadelphia, Johnson tied his career-high in receiving with five grabs for 62 yards. Johnson leads the Saints with 11 receiving touchdowns over the past three seasons, while being tied for sixth among league tight ends.

Johnson has gotten off to a positive start in 2023, leading the team's tight ends group in receiving with seven grabs for 61 yards.

Signed as an undrafted free agent out of Notre Dame in 2020, RB **Tony Jones Jr.** first made his playing debut in the team's regular season finale as a rookie. In 2021, he rushed for 142 yards in 11 games with four starts. In 2022, after splitting the season between New Orleans and Seattle, Jones returned to the Saints practice squad at the end of the 2023 preseason. In four contests, Jones has rushed for 70 yards and his first two NFL touchdowns and on Sept. 24 at Green Bay, added a career-high four receptions for 21 yards

Defensive end **Carl Granderson** played in 15 games in 2021 with three starts and posted 24 tackles and three sacks. In 2022, he posted 53 stops (30 solo) and a career-high 5.5 sacks, recovering the first fumble of his career on December 5 at Tampa Bay. In the Christmas Eve win at Cleveland, Granderson, sacked Browns Quarterback Deshaun Watson at the Saints 22-yard line on fourth down with 19 seconds left in the fourth quarter to secure the win. The following week on January 1, 2023 at Philadelphia, he posted two stops, 1.5 sacks, one stop for loss and two quarterback hits, as Granderson posted at least half a takedown in three consecutive weeks for the first time in his career.

Earning the starting right end position in 2023, Granderson has posted 13 tackles, leads the team with 2.5 sacks and has forced a fumble, signing a four-year contract extension on September 23. In the Sept. 18 win over Carolina, Granderson had a standout performance with two solo tackles and a sack/forced fumble of Panthers rookie quarterback Bryce Young to save a potential score.

Punter **Lou Hedley** was signed following the 2023 NFL Draft by the Saints out of the University of Miami, where he played from 2019-22 and punted 206 times for 9,315 yards with a 45.2 gross punting average and 77 inside-the-20. The Australia native, who won the punting job in a punting competition in training camp at 30 years old earned All-ACC second-team honors in 2021 and was selected as a semifinalist for the Ray Guy Award, honoring the nation's top punter. In 2020, Hedley was recognized with AP second-team All-American honors and a Ray Guy Award finalist, as the Hurricanes ranked second in the FBS in net punting average. In 2023, he has punted 21 times for 906 yards with a 43.1 gross punting average, a 39.2 net and eight inside the 20-yard line to tie for third in the NFL.

Kicker **Blake Grupe** was signed by New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Notre Dame, where he played his graduate campaign in 2022, after handling kicking duties at Arkansas State from 2017-21. In 2022, he led the Fighting Irish with 91 points on 14-of-19 field goals and a perfect 49-for-49 in PATs. The Missouri native was Arkansas State's career record holder in scoring (354), field goals (64) and PATs (162). In the 2023 preseason, Grupe secured a roster spot, by making five-of-six field goal attempts.

In the team's first four games, Grupe has made nine of ten field goal attempts and all five PAT attempts to lead the team with 32 points, tied for 19th in the NFL, while also tying for 11th in the NFL with 17 touchbacks on kickoffs.

Wide Receiver **Keith Kirkwood** originally joined the Saints as an undrafted free agent out of Temple in 2018. The New Jersey native spent the first two months of his rookie season on the New Orleans practice squad, before being signed to the active roster at midseason and recording 13 receptions for 209 yards (16.1 avg.) with two touchdowns. He added one more scoring grab in the NFC Divisional playoff win over Philadelphia to help the Saints advance to the NFC Championship. After spending most of the 2019 campaign on Injured Reserve and playing for Carolina from 2020-21, Kirkwood returned to New Orleans in 2022, where he contributed on offense and special teams. In the 2023 preseason opening win over Kansas City, he caught

a four-yard touchdown pass from QB Derek Carr.

1 – With the Sept. 10 16-15 season-opening win over Tennessee, Head Coach Dennis Allen became the first Saints head coach to win his first two season openers in charge of the team.

2 – With his 200th career start (regular season and post-season combined) on Dec. 24, 2022 at Cleveland, defensive end Cameron Jordan joined quarterback Drew Brees as only the second Saint reach that milestone. Playing in his 206th career game (regular season and postseason combined) on Sept. 24 at Green Bay, Jordan surpassed Thomas Morstead for sole possession of second on the club's games played list. With 196 regular season appearances, Jordan is tied for second with K Morten Andersen and will surpass Anderson on Sunday at New England.

3 – The number of times New Orleans has posted a shut-out since 2017. Also with a 76-yard punt return for a touchdown on Sunday at Green Bay, WR/RS Rashid Shaheed had the third-longest touchdown return in franchise history.

4 – The number of Saints players who have appeared in 200 games in a Black and Gold uniform (regular season and postseason combined), with Jordan joining Brees, punter Thomas Morstead and kicker Morten Andersen in 2022.

5 – The Saints have won a franchise-record five consecutive season openers dating back to the 2019 season. The five-game winning streak for season openers is the longest current running streak in the NFL. Also the career-high number of passes defensed CB Alontae Taylor had on Sept. 24 at Green Bay.

PRACTICE MAKES PERFECT

A spot on the practice squad is another avenue to eventually get onto the active roster and have the opportunity to contribute. Below is an overview of nine key contributors players on the club's Week One 53-man roster with extensive practice squad experience.

TE **Juwan Johnson** was signed by New Orleans out of Oregon, where he spent his graduate transfer season, following the 2020 NFL Draft as a wideout. Recording four receptions for 39 yards in seven contests, Johnson spent the majority of his rookie season on the practice squad. Converted to tight end in 2021 and leading the position group with four touchdowns, Johnson took advantage of his first full offseason strength and conditioning program in 2022, led the tight ends group with 42 receptions for 508 yards with a club-best seven TD grabs, tied for third in the league at his position.

After spending his first three seasons with the Seattle Seahawks, contributing on both defense and special teams, DB **Ugo Amadi** split the 2022 campaign between the Titans active roster and the Kansas City Chiefs practice squad, also appearing in one contest for Kansas City. Possessing the versatility to play in multiple roles, Amadi secured a roster spot with the Saints in the preseason, recording eight tackles, one interception, two passes defensed and one coverage stop. He has contributed on both defense and special teams in four games.

After splitting his rookie season in 2018 between the practice squad and active roster, DV **J.T. Gray** enjoyed a breakthrough campaign in 2019, when he was selected AP second-team All-Pro when he recorded 16 special teams tackles, one blocked punt and one coverage fumble recovery. In 2021, he was selected as a first-team All-Pro and to his first career Pro Bowl (starter), when he led the NFL with 19 special teams tackles (league-leading 16 solo). Gray led the team with 12 special teams stops in 2022, despite missing three games with a hamstring, the third time in four seasons, he has led New Orleans in coverage tackles. After missing the 2023 opener with a shoulder injury, he has three stops in his last three contests.

WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed** came to New Orleans as one of the all-time best Division I-AA returners and after spending the first five weeks on the practice squad, made a quick impact on Oct. 16 vs. Cincinnati with a 44-yard rushing TD. With his 53-yard receiving touchdown on October 20 at Arizona, Shaheed became the only Saint to score touchdowns on each of his first two career offensive touches. In addition to finishing with 28 grabs for 488 yards (17.4 avg.) with two touchdowns, Shaheed also handled return duties for New Orleans since being activated, bringing back 20

punts for 193 yards (9.7 avg.). He made big contribution's in the Sept. 10 season opening win over Tennessee with a career-high 216 all-purpose yards, including five receptions for 89 yards, including a 19-yard touchdown and a late fourth quarter 41-yard grab to help secure the victory. In the Sept. 18 win over Carolina, he posted four catches for 63 yards (15.8 avg.), including a fourth quarter 45-yard grab. On Sept. 24 at Green Bay, Shaheed had a 76-yard punt return for a touchdown.

WR **Keith Kirkwood** originally joined the Saints as an undrafted free agent out of Temple in 2018. The New Jersey native spent the first two months of his rookie season on the New Orleans practice squad, before being signed to the active roster at midseason and recording 13 receptions for 209 yards (16.1 avg.) with two touchdowns. He added one more scoring grab in the NFC Divisional Playoff win over Philadelphia to help the Saints advance to the NFC Championship. After spending most of the 2019 campaign on Injured Reserve and playing for Carolina from 2020-21, Kirkwood returned to New Orleans in 2022, where he has contributed on offense and special teams.

FB **Adam Prentice** was originally signed by Denver following the 2021 NFL Draft out of South Carolina. Joining the Saints at the conclusion of the 2021 preseason, Prentice appeared in seven games with three starts for New Orleans, carrying three times for five yards and catching three passes for 16 yards, while making one special teams stop. In 2022, he played in 11 games with two starts, rushing four times for nine yards, catching three passes for nine yards and also contributing on special teams with three tackles. Prentice recorded one coverage stop in the season opening win over Tennessee and has also contributed as a lead blocker in 2023.

LB **Nephi Sewell** was signed by New Orleans following the 2022 NFL Draft out of Utah and appeared in four games as a rookie, contributing on special teams, while spending the remainder of the campaign on the practice squad. Sewell has progressed on both defense and special teams and secured a spot on the 53-man roster, making his first two career coverage stops on Sept. 24 at Green Bay.

Originally a third round draft pick of the Broncos in 2018, **Isaac Yiadom** has played in 74 games with 21 starts for Denver, the Giants, Green Bay, Houston and New Orleans and has posted 118 tackles, a split sack, two interceptions, 19 passes defensed, one forced fumble and 19 special teams stops. After starting 2022 with the Texans, Yiadom joined the Saints practice squad midway through the season and upon being signed to the active roster, recorded two special teams stops in six appearances. In 2023, Yiadom has contributed on both defense and special teams, playing in four games with one start, recording 11 tackles, one interception, seven passes defensed and one coverage stop.

Ahead is a synopsis of several returning players and newcomers through the draft and free agency to the 2023 Saints offensive line:

T/G James Hurst - A nine-year NFL veteran who was signed as a free agent from Baltimore in 2020, Hurst has 138 career regular season appearances with 83 starts at three different positions on the inside and outside. His versatility came in handy in 2020, as he started two contests at left tackle and one at left guard, while the Saints gained over 200 yards rushing each time. In 2021, Hurst moved into the lineup for eight games at left tackle in place of an injured Armstead, two at left guard in place of an injured Andrus Peat and three at right tackle for an injured Ryan Ramczyk. Hurst started 15 games at left tackle and one at left guard in 2022, the position he has opened three games at left guard and one at right guard in 2023.

RT Ryan Ramczyk - The Black and Gold used their second first round selection in the 2017 NFL Draft to snag Ramczyk out of the University of Wisconsin, one of the best offensive linemen in the entire draft. After opening all 16 games and both postseason contests in 2017 and being selected as a PFWA All-Rookie, he has been selected as an *Associated Press* All-Pro selection three times since. After missing seven contests in 2021, Ramczyk rebounded to open the first 16 games in 2022 and continues to anchor the right side of the line.

T/G Andrus Peat - A first round selection (13th overall) in the 2015 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Peat was considered one of the top college linemen in 2014. In nine seasons, he's played in 99 regular season games with 91 starts, opening a contest at every position except center. In 2020, he opened 13 contests at left guard as he was part of the NFC Pro squad for the third consecutive season. In 2021, he opened the first six contests, where New Orleans got off to a 4-2 start before suffering a season-ending pectoral injury. In his return to the starting lineup in the 2022 season opener in Atlanta, New Orleans rushed for 151 yards. In back-to-back weeks, Peat was a part of rushing efforts of 200-yards plus by the club for the first time since 2020. On Sept. 24, Peat moved into left guard after a concussion suffered by Cesar Ruiz and started this past Sunday vs. Tampa Bay before being forced to depart with a concussion.

C/G Erik McCoy - New Orleans traded up in the second round of the 2019 NFL Draft to select this standout from Texas A&M, who was a three-year starter, anchoring the middle of the Aggies line. In 2018, he was a team captain who paved the way for the SEC's leading rusher and in

2019 was the first Saint in franchise history to start at center in Week One, opening all 16 contests. McCoy has opened all 61 contests he has appeared in at center and signed a five-year contract extension with the team in 2022.

G/C Cesar Ruiz - The hard-working, talented and intelligent lineman is a perfect fit for New Orleans' culture. He was selected with the 24th pick in the 2020 NFL Draft out of the University of Michigan. The three-year letterman played in 36 games in college, starting his last 31 including the final 26 at center, earning All-Big Ten in 2019. Ruiz settled in at right guard in the last 15 games, with nine starts, as well as both postseason contests. When McCoy suffered a lower leg injury in the first quarter of the 2021 opening win over Green Bay, Ruiz transitioned over to his natural position, where the Saints did not give up a sack in his four starts at center. He returned to right guard on Oct. 25 at Seattle and was the only lineman in 2021 to not miss a start. Ruiz opened 13 games at right guard and one at center in 2022 before suffering a season-ending foot injury Dec. 18, vs. Atlanta. The 46 consecutive starts for Ruiz at the time of his injury was the longest active streak for a Saint. Following an ardent rehab, Ruiz returned to the starting lineup for the season opener on September 10, the day after signing a four-year contract extension.

T Landon Young - A mainstay at left tackle for his entire college career at Kentucky, Young played in 49 contests with 30 starts in his college career. The Lexington, Ky. native was selected by New Orleans in the sixth round of the 2021 NFL Draft and held up to the competition in training camp to snare a roster spot. Young opened one contest at right tackle in 2021 and serves as Ramczyk's backup on the right side, also playing jumbo tight end. In 2022, Young showed versatility. On October 13 at Pittsburgh, he slide over to left tackle for the second half to replace Hurst (concussion) and opened this the November 20 win over the Rams at one of the league's most challenging positions. In the January 1, 2023 win at Philadelphia, Young played the final three quarters in place of Ramczyk (hip) and then started the following week's season finale vs. Carolina.

T Trevor Penning - The club's second first round draft choice (19th overall) in 2022 out of Northern Iowa, the 6-7, 322-pound Penning competed with Hurst for the starting left tackle slot in the preseason before suffering a toe injury. The Clear Lake, Iowa native brings athleticism and extensive college experience to the tackle position, where he played in 37 games with 33 starts. Activated for the second half of the season, Penning served as the club's sixth offensive lineman in jumbo packages and started the season finale at left tackle, carrying over in 2023 to start at the position in the first four contests with rapidly improving results.

IN THE NFL

After finishing ranked seventh in 2021, surrendering 318.2 net yards per game, the New Orleans defense returned to the top five again in 2022, ranking fifth, while giving up 314.8 net yards per game. New Orleans and San Francisco are the only two teams to rank in the top ten each of the last three seasons and this marked the third time the Saints have ranked in the top ten in total defense for three straight seasons (1982-84 and 1991-93).

Voted by teammates as the club's special teams captain for the first time, Gray led the NFL with 19 tackles in 16 games, as he was selected as a Pro Bowl starter and as the team's only first-team *Associated Press* All-Pro. Playing in 70 career games, Gray has career totals of 59 special teams stops, a blocked punt, three fumble recoveries and ten defensive tackles, 2.5 sacks and a pass defense, ranked first on the team with 12 coverage stops in 2022 despite missing three games (hamstring). In 2023, despite missing the season opener with a shoulder injury, he leads the team with three coverage stops. A third round draft pick of the Denver Broncos in 2018 out of Boston College, in addition to starting 21 of his 74 career contests on defense and posting 118 tackles, a split sack, two interceptions, 19 passes defended and a forced fumble, **Isaac Yiadom** has recorded 19 career coverage stops for five teams. Brought up to the active roster during Gray's injury, Yiadom brought a boost to the Saints coverage units with two stops, remaining an integral part of the group after Gray's return to the lineup and re-signing in the offseason.

One of the club's two third round draft picks in 2020, **Zack Baun**, a former Wisconsin standout, has embraced work on the team's special teams units. He has recorded 20 tackles on coverage, one blocked field goal and 42 defensive stops. On Sept. 10 at Tennessee, Baun got his hands on a punt that went out of bounds one yard past the line of scrimmage, a game-changing play.

Selected in the second round of the 2019 NFL Draft by the Houston Texans out of Kentucky, DB **Lonnie Johnson Jr.** provides extensive experience and depth to the Saints defensive and special teams units. In 60 games with 19 starts for the Texans, Tennessee Titans and Saints, Johnson has posted 17 coverage stops, in addition to posting 169 defensive tackles, four interceptions and 15 passes defended. Johnson has found a significant role on multiple special teams units for New Orleans after signing in the offseason as an unrestricted free agent and ranks among team leaders with two tackles.

QUARTERBACKS

DEREK CARR

• On March 6, 2023 the New Orleans Saints agreed to terms with QB Derek Carr on a four-year contract to solidify the team's quarterback position. He spent the first nine seasons of his NFL career with the Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders. Originally selected in the second round (36th overall) of the 2014 NFL Draft by the Raiders out of Fresno State, the Bakersfield, Calif. native has started all 146 career regular season games he's played in, completing 3,281-of-5,082 passes (64.6 percent) for 35,985 yards with 219 touchdown passes, 101 interceptions and a 91.6 passer rating, while adding 846 rushing yards and six touchdowns. From 2014-22 as a member of the Raiders, Carr was selected to four Pro Bowl Games (2015-17, 2022) and set numerous team passing records including the franchise's career passing yardage and touchdown pass marks and single-season mark in passing yards (4,804 in 2021), as the only signal-caller in the team's history with multiple seasons reaching the 4,000 yard mark. He also holds franchise records from his Raiders tenure for multiple-touchdown pass games (69), contests with a passer rating of at least 100.0 (47) and 300-yard passing performances (33).

• Since entering the league in 2014, Carr ranks third in the NFL in completions, fourth in passing yardage and seventh in passing touchdowns. He became the third quarterback in history to pass for 3,000-plus yards in each of his first nine seasons, joining Pro Football Hall of Fame signal-caller Peyton Manning and Russell Wilson. He is just the fourth player in NFL history to reach 35,000 passing yards in his first nine seasons. He has completed 282 passes of 25+ yards since he entered the league in 2014, the fifth-most in the NFL over that span. His 146 starts are the most by a quarterback since 2014.

• Carr enjoyed a successful Saints debut in the Sept. 10 win over Tennessee, when he completed 23-of-33 passes (69.7%) for 305 yards with one touchdown, one interception and a 96.1 passer rating.

• Carr helped lead New Orleans to a 20-17 victory at Carolina on Monday Night Football on Sept. 18, when in the second half, he completed a 42-yard pass to Chris Olave and a 45-yard pass to Rashid Shaheed to set up the Saints' two touchdowns.

• On Sept. 24 at Green Bay, Carr had completed 13-of-18 (72.2%) of his passes for 103 yards with an eight-yard scoring throw to TE Jimmy Graham and a 104.6 passer rating to help put New Orleans ahead 17-0 over the Packers before being forced to leave in the third quarter with a sprained AC joint injury that puts his status at day-to-day for this week's matchup against Tampa Bay.

- The 2013 Heisman Trophy winner at Florida State and the first pick in the 2015 NFL Draft, Winston has appeared in 88 games with 80 starts, completing 1,748-of-2,852 passes (61.3%) for 21,941 yards with 139 touchdowns, 97 interceptions and an 87.5 rating, adding 1,220 rushing yards and 11 touchdowns. In 2021, before suffering a season-ending knee injury in Week Eight, Winston completed 95-of-161 passes for 1,170 yards, 14 touchdowns, three interceptions and a 102.8 passer rating, ranked first in the NFL at the time of his injury in touchdown percentage (8.7).

- Serving as the backup to Carr with extensive starting experience, Winston has completed 10-of-17 passes for 101 yards.

TAYSOM HILL

- Hill's brought unheralded versatility to the Saints offense and special teams. A constant participant on special teams from midseason in 2017 to midseason in 2020, as well as the backup signal-caller and as a runner and receiver, in 2018, Hill averaged 24.9 yards per return on 14 kickoff returns, had six coverage stops, second on the team, completed a ten-yard pass on a fake punt and blocked a punt. Overall, Hill carried 37 times for 196 yards (5.3 avg.), third on the team, with two touchdowns and completed three of seven passes for 64 yards. The blocked punt that sparked a division-clinching win at Tampa Bay, earned him Week 14 NFC Special Teams Player of the Week honors. In the postseason, he caught a touchdown, made a special teams tackle and executed a successful fake punt, making significant contributions in all facets as the team advanced to the NFC Championship game for the third time in franchise history.

• In 2019, Hill carried 27 times for 156 yards (5.8 avg.) with a touchdown, catching 19 passes for 234 yards with six TDs, deflecting a punt and posting two coverage stops. He ranked third on the club in touchdowns and third in receiving TDs. After a multi-threat performance Thanksgiving night at Atlanta, when he deflected a punt and caught and rushed for a touchdown. Hill became the first quarterback to rush for and catch a touchdown in the same contest since Jim McMahon (1983). In a valiant postseason effort vs. Minnesota, Hill led the team in rushing with four carries for 50 yards, caught two passes for 25 yards with a TD and completed a 50-yard pass.

• In 2020, Hill contributed on multiple facets, completing 88-of-121 passes (72.7%) for 928 yards with a 98.8 rating, rushing 87 times for 457 (5.3 avg.) yards with eight touchdowns, catching eight passes for 98 yards with a TD and playing on special teams units until Brees' rib injury. Following Brees' injury, Nov. 15, Hill went 3-1 in four starts.

• In 12 games with nine starts in 2021, providing value at quarterback on offense and special teams, he completed 78-of-134 passes for 978 yards with four touchdowns, carried 70 times for 374 yards (5.3 avg.) with a club-best five touchdowns, caught four passes for 52 yards and added a special teams stop.

• In 2022, Hill assisted the Black and Gold offense in multiple facets. He contributed on both offense and special teams in the season opener at Atlanta, Hill carried four times for a club-best 81 yards (20.3 avg.), including a career-long 57-yard carry, as well as an 11-yard rushing touchdown on the same first quarter drive of his long run. Hill also caught a pass for a two-yard gain and contributed on multiple special teams units both on the coverage and return teams. Overall, he ranked second on the team in rushing with 96 carries for a career-high 575 yards (club-best 6.0 avg.) with a club-best seven rushing touchdowns, nine catches for 75 yards with two scores, leading the team in total touchdowns, while completing 13-of-19 passes for 240 yards with two touchdown throws and a 146.3 passer rating.

HILL MOVES THE CHAINS

In the Sept. 18 win at Carolina, Hill's importance to his team was even further accentuated after running back Jamaal Williams suffered a hamstring injury in the second quarter that left only one healthy tailback on the active roster. Hill carried nine times for 75 yards, including gaining a key 11-yard rush on New Orleans' final possession for the first down, allowing the Saints to kneel down for an important 20-17 divisional victory. In addition, he completed his only passing attempt for an eight-yard gain in the contest. Over the past two seasons, Hill has been especially successful moving the chains with his legs with 40 of his

116 rushes going for first downs. The 34.5 rushing first down percentage ranks sixth in the NFL over that time.

• Signed by the Saints as an unrestricted free agent from Detroit in the offseason, Williams is a talented runner who had a breakout season in 2022, as he led the National Football League and set a Lions single-season franchise record for rushing touchdowns with 17. In 17 games with nine starts for Detroit, Williams added on 262 attempts for 1,066 rushing yards and 12 receptions for 73 yards, producing the first 1,000 yard rushing season of his career.

• The former BYU star's talent came consistently all over the field, as well as in short bursts, as ten of his rushing touchdowns in 2022 came from exactly one yard out, tied for third-most in NFL history. A sound ballcarrier, he went 752 career touches before fumbling the ball and became the league's first active running back to reach 600 carries before fumbling.

• Since being drafted by Green Bay in the fourth round (134th overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft, Williams has played in 92 games with 42 starts, totaling 942 attempts for 3,726 yards and 30 touchdowns, while adding 162 receptions for 1,198 yards and eight touchdowns against only five fumbles.

ALVIN KAMARA

• A talented runner and receiver with a 5-10, 215-pound frame who was selected by the Saints in the third round of the 2017 NFL Draft out of the University of Tennessee, Kamara enjoyed an outstanding rookie campaign. He ranked first on the club and sixth in the NFL in yards from scrimmage (1,554), second on the team in rushing and receiving, carrying 120 times for 728 yards (6.1 avg.) with eight TDs and a two-point conversion, catching 81 passes for 826 yards (10.2 avg.) with five TDs and a kickoff return for a TD for a club rookie record 14 total scores, tied for second in the NFL. Kamara finished first in the NFL in yards per carry.

•Kamara was the first Saints offensive rookie selected to the Pro Bowl since Rueben Mayes (1986), as an AP second team All-Pro (flex), the clubs' first rookie All-Pro since 1993. He was named *The Sporting News* NFL Rookie of the Year and AP NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year.

In the Saints' 2020 Christmas Day 52-33 win over the Vikings, Kamara tied the NFL record for total touchdowns and rushing touchdowns (6), as he carried 22 times for a career-high 155 yards (7.0 avg.), adding three receptions for 17 yards for 172 yards from scrimmage. WIDE RECEIVERS

CHRIS OLAVE

• A talented wide receiver who became one of the most prolific receivers in Buckeyes history, Olave played in 47 games and caught 176 passes for 2,711 yards (15.4 avg.) with 35 touchdowns. Olave's 35 career touchdown receptions set an Ohio State program record and ranks fourth in Big Ten history. His 11 career 100-yard games also ranks second in school history. Olave entered the starting lineup in 2019 with immediate results. He helped lead the Buckeyes to three consecutive Big Ten championships (2018-2020) and back-to-back College Football Playoff appearances (2019, 2020). In the 2020 CFP Semifinal vs. Clemson, Olave had a career night, hauling in six passes for 132 yards and two touchdowns in a 49-28 win, securing a bid to play in the championship game. Olave seamlessly integrated into the Saints offense following a standout senior campaign, where he caught 65 passes for 936 yards (14.4 avg.) and 13 touchdowns, tied for sixth nationally, as he was selected as an AFCA first-team All-American and a consensus second-team All-American.

• Following a September, where he captured NFL Offensive Rookie of the Month honors with 17 grabs for a league rookie-best 268 yards, including scoring receiving touchdowns in back to back contests, Olave led the team in receiving, yards per catch and receiving yardage with 72 grabs for 1,042 yards (14.5 avg.) with four touchdowns along with a successful two-point conversion, ranking second among rookies in receiving yardage and tied for second in catches and third down grabs (26). Olave became the first Saints rookie since Danny Abramowicz (1967) to lead the team in receiving, receiving yardage and yards per catch in his first campaign. The receiving yardage total was second all-time among Saints rookies, as he was only the third Black and Gold rookie to reach 1,000.

He became the first Saints rookie to break 1,000 yards since Marques Colston (1,038-2006). RETURN TO ACTION

After being sidelined for all but three games in 2022 with a toe injury that required surgery, Thomas has had a successful return to the field in 2023, ranking second on the team in receiving with 22 receptions for 219 yards.

TIGHT ENDS

JUWAN JOHNSON

- The former Penn State and Oregon wideout joined the Saints in 2020 following the NFL Draft and transitioned to tight end his second season. In 2022, the New Jersey native had a breakout campaign as he appeared in 16 games with 12 starts and finished with 42 receptions for 508 yards and a team-best seven touchdown grabs. Johnson's touchdown grab total was tied for third among NFL tight ends.

- In three games in 2023, Johnson leads the Saints tight ends with seven receptions for 61 yards.

FOSTER MOREAU

- This veteran tight end and New Orleans native enters his fifth NFL season and first with the Black and Gold after spending his first four seasons with the Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders. In his career, Moreau has appeared in 63 regular season games with 36 starts and has recorded 93 receptions for 1,127 yards (12.1 avg.) with 12 touchdowns and has posted at least 30 catches in each of his last two campaigns. In 2022, the former Jesuit High School and LSU standout set career-highs in receptions (33) and receiving yards (420), while adding two touchdowns.

- While also serving as an important blocking presence, Moreau got involved in the stat sheet in the Sept. 18 win at Carolina with two receptions for 20 yards.

JIMMY GRAHAM

- New Orleans' third round draft choice in 2010 after playing four years of basketball and just one year of football at the University of Miami (Fla.). Graham broke out in his second year with the Saints totaling 99 catches for 1,310 yards with 11 touchdowns and went on to lead the team in receiving for four consecutive seasons. Graham's production has been among the top 10 in NFL history at the tight end position in all three major categories: receptions, yards, and receiving touchdowns. Graham posts career totals of 714 receptions, 8,514 yards, and 86 touchdowns. His 86 receiving touchdowns rank 4th all time among NFL tight ends,

while his 52 touchdowns as a Saint rank 2nd in franchise history. He and Kansas City's Travis Kelce are the only two tight ends in NFL history to have multiple seasons of 1,200-plus receiving yards and 10- plus receiving touchdowns. Graham returns to New Orleans, the location of his most personal and team success, after playing in seven campaigns with three other teams.

Saints TE Jimmy Graham's 86 career touchdown receptions rank fourth among tight ends all-time, his 714 receptions seventh and his 8,514 receiving yards eighth.

•New Orleans' first choice in the 2011 NFL Draft (24th overall) out of California, Jordan enjoyed another standout season in 2022, recording 66 tackles, a club-best 8.5 sacks for a loss of 67.5 yards, a team-high 12 stops for loss and 14 quarterback hits, two passes defensed and two forced fumbles to tie for the team lead.

During this time, the Saints own a 57-23 regular season record when he corrals a signal-caller, and they boast a 24-3 mark in a multi-sack performance in the regular season, including a three-sack performance on Jan. 1, 2023 at Philadelphia that made him the franchise's all-time leader in sacks, the same opponent of his first three-sack performance in 2012. DEMARIO DAVIS

- This dependable and sure-tackling defender joined the New Orleans Saints in 2018 after spending his first six National Football League seasons with the New York Jets and Cleveland Browns. For his career, the Brandon, Miss. native has appeared in 181 career regular season games with 166 starts for the Jets (2012-15, 2017), Cleveland (2016) and the Saints (2018-), recording 1,239 stops (802 solo), 37 sacks, three interceptions, 51 passes defended, three forced fumbles, seven fumble recoveries and 24 special teams tackles. With a club-best seven stops on Jan. 1, 2023 at Philadelphia, Davis joined Bobby Wagner and Lavonte David as only the third active NFL player with 1,200 stops.

- In 2018, Davis opened all 16 contests and led the team with 110 stops (74 solo), five sacks to lead the linebackers, four passes defended, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. Davis' abilities to diagnose and tackle played a key role in New Orleans ranking *second in the* NFL in opponent rushing yards per game and opponent rushing yards per play. Participating in the postseason for the first time, Davis led the defense with 22 stops (15 solo), an interception in the NFC Championship and a pass defense. IRON MAN

Davis who had never missed a game in his career until December 27, 2021 vs. Miami due to COVID-19 protocols, ranks as one of the league's most durable defenders, while playing one of the game's most physically demanding positions. His 158 consecutive games played streak was the longest in the NFL by a position player and his 79 straight games started were the most at his position. In 2022, Davis was one of three Black and Gold starting defenders to open every contest, joining safety Tyrann Mathieu and defensive tackle David Onyemata. More impressive, he was the only linebacker in the NFL to play in every defensive snap for his teams.

PETE WERNER

• New Orleans selected this three-year starter from Ohio State in the second round of the 2021 NFL Draft. The Indianapolis native finished his college career playing in 47 career games with 35 starts, recording 185 tackles (111 solo), 16 stops for loss, four sacks, 11 passes defensed, four forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Werner helped power the Buckeyes to the College Football Playoff championship game as a senior in 2020, when he was voted by Big Ten coaches as a first-team All-Conference selection and a Butkus Award semifinalist, posting 54 tackles, 2.5 stops for loss, one sack and two forced fumbles. Werner made his second career start Oct. 3 vs. the Giants and recorded a ten tackles. With 13 stops in Week Five at Washington, he became the first Saints rookie defender to reach double-digit totals in back-to-back games. He ranked fifth on the team with 59 tackles.

• Werner enjoyed a standout 2022 season, appearing in 12 games with 11 starts at weakside linebacker and ranked third on the team and second at the linebacker position, despite missing five games, with 79 tackles (55 solo), three stop for loss, three passes defensed, two forced fumbles and one special teams tackle.

• Werner got off to an impressive start for the 2023 season, finishing second on the team with eight stops in the Sept. 10 season-opening win over Tennessee, one stop for loss and a split sack, his first career takedown. Leading or tying for the team lead in stops in the last three contests, Werner has a club-best 34 stops, a split sack and one quarterback hit for the season from the weakside position.

• This versatile, hard-hitting, playmaking safety and New Orleans native returned home, signing after the draft and brings extensive experience to the secondary. Mathieu was selected by the Arizona Cardinals in the third round (69th overall) in the 2013 NFL Draft out of LSU and has played for the Cardinals (2013-17), Houston Texans (2018), Kansas City Chiefs (2019-21) and now the Saints. In 11 NFL seasons, he has played in 150 regular season games with 141 starts and has posted career totals of 715 tackles (59 solo), 42 stops for loss, ten sacks for a loss of 78 yards, 29 interceptions for 379 returns yards, three brought back for touchdowns, 91 passes defensed, four forced fumbles, seven fumble recoveries and five special teams stops. Mathieu has been selected to three Pro Bowls, three *Associated Press* All-Pro teams and the Pro Football Hall of Fame's 2010's All-Decade Team.

NOSE FOR THE BALL

Mathieu came to New Orleans after starting all 16 games he played in for Kansas City in 2021 and recording 76 tackles, one sack, a career-high three fumble recoveries, one sack and two interceptions to earn his second consecutive Pro Bowl selection. With a team-leading three picks and one fumble recovery, adding up to a team-best four takeaways to go with a career-high 91 tackles (club-best 64 solo) to rank third on the team and first in the secondary.

Mathieu's 29 picks since coming into the league in 2013 are ranked fourth in the NFL. 2022 marked the fourth consecutive season that he led the team he played for in picks.

CB MARSHON LATTIMORE

• Selected by the Saints in the first round (11th overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft, Lattimore started all 13 games he appeared in. He totaled 53 tackles (44 solo), a forced fumble, one fumble recovery, five interceptions for 85 yards and 18 passes defensed, as he became the youngest Saint (21 years old) ever selected to the Pro Bowl and was selected as the *AP* NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year.

• In 2018, Lattimore opened all 16 contests and posted a career-high 59 tackles (49 solo), two interceptions, 12 passes defensed, a club-best four forced fumbles (tied for fourth in the NFL) and three fumble recoveries returned for 91 yards, leading the team in takeaways and tied for the NFL lead in defensive fumble recoveries, the highest total among defensive backs.

• A standout 2019 campaign by Lattimore resulted in him being voted to the Pro Bowl, the only Saints cornerback to ever be selected multiple times. Lattimore started all 14 games he played in and posted 57 stops, one interception and ranked first on the team with 14 passes defensed.

• In 2020, he posted a career-high 62 tackles (52 solo), two interceptions and 11 passes defensed as he was voted to the Pro Bowl for the third time.

• After signing a contract extension in 2021, Lattimore continued to fulfill high expectations as he posted 68 stops, three picks, a career-high 19 passes defensed, ranked third in the NFL and one fumble recovery, being selected to his fourth Pro Bowl.

• After missing ten games (abdomen) in 2022, Lattimore returned to action Jan. 1, 2023 at Philadelphia and made an instant impact, tying for the team lead with six solo tackles, a team-high two passes defensed and returning an interception 12 yards for a touchdown for New Orleans' first defensive score of the season. He started all seven games he appeared in and posted 21 stops, the pick for a score and four passes defensed.

• To open 2023, Lattimore came up with a standout performance in the season-opening win over Tennessee. In addition to his 15th career pick, to move him into a tie for eighth place in club record books in interceptions, he also had four passes defensed, the third time in his career, he has deflected at least four throws in a contest.

GET A HAND UP

Lattimore's 84 passes defended since entering the NFL in 2017 are the most by a Saint and ranked third in the league despite missing ten games in 2022.

CB PAULSON ADEBO

- New Orleans' third round selection (76th overall) in the 2021 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Adebo overcame not playing college football in 2020 to make significant contributions to the Saints secondary in his first season with the club. The Texas native finished his college career playing in 22 games with 21 starts for Stanford and recording 97 tackles, 34 passes defended and eight interceptions, earning All-Pac 12 honors in both 2018 and 2019.

- Adebo showed his development by opening opposite Lattimore in the 2021 regular season opening win vs. Green Bay and returning a pick 33 yards in the third quarter to become the first Saints defender to have an interception in his NFL debut since LB James Allen vs. Tampa Bay on September 8, 2002. He then added a second pick in the Week Five win at Washington. With a pick in the regular season finale at Atlanta, Adebo finished his rookie campaign ranked fifth on the club with 63 tackles (54 solo), tied for first with three picks and added eight passes defended and two special teams stops.

- Adebo fought off injuries and played in 13 games with 12 starts to lead the team's corners with 60 tackles (51 solo) and added seven passes defended for the NFL's second-ranked club in opponent passing yards per game.

- Sharpened by an extensive training camp competition, Adebo recorded his first interception since his rookie year in the season-opening win over Tennessee and a fumble recovery in Monday night's win at Carolina.

- A Saints victory would improve their all-time record against the Patriots to 6-10 and even their road mark at New England to 5-5.

- LB Zack Baun is expected to appear in his 50th career regular season contest on Sunday.

SAINTS POSTGAME NOTES

- The New Orleans Saints fell to the Tampa Bay Buccaneers 26-9. The 26 points surrendered ended a franchise-record 11-game streak of giving up 20 points or loss, dating back to the 2022 season.
- With the loss, the Saints are now 2-2 overall, 1-1 at home and 1-1 in NFC South contests on the season. New Orleans returns to action on Sunday, October 8, when they take on the New England Patriots at Gillette Stadium in Foxboro, Mass. Kickoff is set for 12:00 p.m. CT.
- After the loss, New Orleans' all-time regular season record against Tampa Bay is now currently 39-24 and falls to currently 21-13 in games played in the Caesars Superdome.
- The Saints tallied 197 yards of total offense (70 rushing and 127 passing). Meanwhile, they surrendered 353 yards (239 passing and 114 rushing) to the Buccaneers. On the 114 rushing yards surrendered, New Orleans only gave up 3.5 yards per rushing attempt, a season-best.
- New Orleans converted 35.7% of its third down attempts (5-of-14) while allowing 53.3% (8-of-15).
- QB **Derek Carr** completed 23 of 37 passes for 127 yards.
- QB/TE **Taysom Hill** carried the ball four times for 10 yards, recorded one catch for seven yards and completed one pass for 13 yards.
- QB **Jameis Winston** replaced Carr late in the fourth quarter. Winston had one attempt that was an interception.
- RB **Alvin Kamara** moved into the Saints top-10 all time in receiving yards with a first-half reception, passing WR Quinn Early.
- Kamara finished the day with 33 receiving yards on 13 catches, as well as 11 carries for 51 yards.
- WR **Michael Thomas** led the Saints with 53 yards receiving on four receptions.
- WR **Rashid Shaheed** recorded three receptions for 33 yards and returned two punts for 45 yards, including a 29-yard runback.
- CB **Isaac Yiadom** recorded his second career interception late in the second quarter. It was his first as a Saint and New Orleans's fifth interception of the season. In total, he had six tackles, ranked third on the team (five solo, tied for a team-high) and two passes defended.
- New Orleans LB **Pete Werner** recorded six tackles in the first half. Werner finished the game with a tie for a team-high eight tackles.

- DE **Cameron Jordan** played in his 196th career regular season game Sunday, surpassing LB Rickey Jackson for the most contests played by a Saints defender and putting him in a tie for second all-time with K Morten Andersen.
- Jordan finished the afternoon with four total tackles.
- DL **Malcolm Roach** tied Werner for the team lead with a career-high eight tackles.
- DL **Bryan Bresee** recorded his first full career sack early in the third quarter. The 2023 first round draft pick finished the afternoon with four total tackles (three solo), including three stops for loss.
- S **Johnathan Abram** had his first career start as a Saint and finished with five tackles.
- K **Blake Grupe** was perfect on the day, nailing all three field goal attempts, including a long of 44 yards. All four of his kickoffs sailed through the end zone for touchbacks.
- LS **Zach Wood** played in his 102nd career game, moving him into a tie with DL Bruce Clark, LS Justin Drescher, WR Joe Horn and RB Wayne Wilson for 51st on the club's all-time games played list and added one assisted special teams tackle.
- P **Lou Hedley** punted four times for 162 yards with a 38.8 net punting average, with a career-high three of his punts dropping inside-the-20-yard line.

(Opening statement) “We got our ass beat today. Unacceptable. Obviously nobody's happy about it and we have to be better. I think we weren't converting third downs offensively, which was a challenge. I don't think we got off the field defensively. Third downs I thought our tackling was not very good, particularly in the first half. We have to execute better. There's a lot of dirty hands that are involved in that performance. Obviously, it starts with me, so I've got to make sure that we put better product out there on the field next time we show up.”

(On the struggle to be consistent offensively) “Obviously, primarily it goes to execution. It's frustrating because we're going to have to score points to win games. So far, it hasn't been good enough. So we have to figure that out.”

(On the play-calling and execution) “I think there's...when you get beat like that, you have to look at it all. If you just said it was all on the execution, then that would look like a cop out, right? So, I think we've got to be better a lot of areas.”

(On Derek Carr's shoulder during the game) “Not during the game, I didn't. He got a little sore there at the end. But there's probably a couple of throws where I felt like it might have come up a little bit short and I don't know that that was relative to the to the shoulder or not.”

(On the momentum for a bit in the second half) “We felt like we had a little something there and look... we had some drives and we had got a little momentum, a few things going and then for one reason or another, we kind of stalled out. We have to get...that has to be fixed because we have to be able to get down in the red area and we have to be able to score touchdowns when we get down there.”

(On being able to get off the field defensively on third down) “That's frustrating. Especially when you get them in longer yardage situations. I thought there was way too many times where (the) quarterback was just running around, running around, running around and buying time. It's hard to hold up in coverage for that long so we got to be better.”

(On the fumble near the end of the first half) “The point was there, get the ball just off the goal line. That was all we were trying to do get the ball off the goal line to where we could just take a knee and get out of the half. That was the plan there. Obviously, we can't have a fumble in that situation. I thought that was a huge play in the game.”

(On the officials call where they ruled on the interception that Isaac Yiadom was on the one-yard line) “I don't know the answer to that.”

(On if he felt like Carr was ready in hindsight) "I don't think there was anything in there that made me feel like you know he can't play. Did he miss some throws? Yeah, he missed some throws. Is it relevant relative (to today's game) or related to the shoulder injury? I can't tell you that. I thought we had some opportunities in the game and I don't think we took advantage of all the opportunities that we had."

(On when in the week he had decided on Carr starting) "I thought probably when he kind of went out Thursday and was able to get with the trainers and throw the ball a little bit and said he felt good. Then obviously, Friday the way he came out and threw the ball around. I didn't see anything on Friday to tell me that he wouldn't be available to play. So, kind of wanted to see how he felt on Saturday after getting a little bit of work and then make sure on Sunday."

(On how choosing Carr as the started affected the game plan) "I don't think that was a major factor in the game plan. I mean, obviously we want to get the ball to Alvin (Kamara). I thought there were some plays to be had with him. But look, overall, we didn't move the ball well enough, we didn't score enough points, we didn't stop them enough defensively."

(On the offensive identity as a concern) "It's a concern. We have to, as coaching staff, we have to do a better job of figuring out what we're going to be able to do, what we can do well and we got to be able to go out and execute those things. Because right now we're not scoring enough points and we know that and we know we have to be better at that. We'll get back and work hard to try to figure out what we can do better and how we can how we can put some points on the board."

(On how they fix the offense) "Well, let's go back and watch the tape and let's see where we made our issues, where our challenges were and what we can...Try to figure out what we can do better. It is hard to say coming right off the field. There's been some things that we've done well, I just don't think we were consistent enough."

(On when he starts to question the play-calling) "I'm not going there. We'll go and we'll look and see what we could have done better, all of us, coaches and players, and then we'll go from there."

(On Juwan Johnson not appearing in the game) "He tweaked his calf in warm ups. We kind of had him get out there through the player introductions and kind of see if he could go and it just looked like he was going to be questionable to be able to go."

(On losing players early in the game) "You kind of go into a game expecting to call a game a certain way and have certain players and to have a guy go out that early is challenging."

(On if he considered switching to Jameis Winston) "No, not until there at the end."

(On if he's surprised where they are offensively considering training camp performances) "Yeah, I don't know if I'd say I'm surprised. I think we all knew it would be a little bit of work in progress. I'm a little concerned that it hasn't been better than it's been. It has to get better and it's our job to fix it."

(On the pass rush) "Yeah, wasn't very good today. Wasn't very good last week. It needs to be better."

(On if the pass rush is the style of the team or self-imposed) "I thought there was times we were back there on the quarterback today we couldn't get him on the ground. So let me look at the tape, I'll try to see what the issues were. But I did think that there were some times we got some pressure and

made him run around a little bit. But I thought tackling was probably the thing that we did worse today, thought it was one of our worst tackling games. We had a third down and chucked the ball down to the back in the flat we're going to be able to get off the field force field goal in the red zone, miss a tackle or goes to the first down, then they end up scoring a touchdown on that on that drive. They hit 83 (Deven Thompkins) on a pass down the field and he made two or three guys miss, that created a big explosive play. I didn't feel like we tackled very well today."

(On if changing the play caller is too drastic a measure) "I don't I don't think we're even going to go down that road right now."

(On restarting the evaluation if Carr looks back and determines his shoulder was affecting him) "Yeah, potentially. That's kind of a hypothetical question right now. We'll see how he got out of the game and then we'll go from there."

(On the trouble in getting Chris Olave involved) "That's hard for me to answer right now. I'll watch the tape and see exactly what was going on. But we've been getting a lot of guys in the game and we ended up having to chuck the ball down probably more than we would have liked to. We will look at and see."

(On the offense in third and short situations) "Well, look, it's just depending on how the defense is... typically, most defenses when it's third and shorter, you're going get some single high safety guys are going to be down on the line of scrimmage and trying to take all the underneath stuff away and there's some opportunities down the field."

Even if we were 0-4, you can still be 13-4 at the end of the year. We are focusing on going 1-0 every week. It's a blessing every opportunity we get to take the field. Your film is your resume. Today we didn't (put) out what we wanted to on film. We have a bunch of more opportunities to do that and I believe that we will."

WR MICHAEL THOMAS

(On the offensive struggles) "That's something where we need to watch the film and correct the mistakes."

(On if they thought they'd be more explosive in the second half) "Of course. That was non-negotiable that we have to go out there and get things going. We knew what the assignment was. We just came up short and failed to execute."

(On the red zone struggles) "We need to have a little bit more sense of urgency and figure out ways to get better. We have to have a sense of urgency always. We have to have a high level of focus. This is our opportunity to fix our mistakes. Sometimes things don't go our way, but we have got to find ways to get better."

(On the frustration level) "It's very frustrating. We don't prepare to lose. No one in this building does. Our coach gives us our assignment and we know exactly what we have to focus on week in and week out. He also tells us whoever makes the least mistakes is going to win the game. That's true. We made a couple of mistakes. We can't turn the ball over against a team like that. We just have to find ways to get better. Guys have to make more plays. As leaders, we take ownership and accountability for it."

DE CAMERON JORDAN

(On getting more turnovers) "It's frustrating that we aren't getting more turnovers. I think we are collapsing the pockets. We are getting hands on the quarterback, but they are not becoming sacks. With the pressures, they will come. You just have to keep on drilling. You have to keep on hitting. You have to keep on giving more. At the end of the day, it's not about what we've done, it's about what can we give."

(On what you can learn from a game like this) "In a game like this, there was an opportunity in the third quarter where the defense took the field and there was a three and out. You have to be able to do that every time. If you don't allow points to be put on the board, then they can't win. We let points go (on the scoreboard) in the first half. That's on us. We had hands on a collapsing pocket on the quarterback (Baker Mayfield). The collapsing pocket wasn't getting him down. He was able to get the ball out however it may be. He made some great plays worthy of him being a former number one overall pick. Kudos to him. I think there was significant pressure on him. We just have to go back to the film and see what happens."

(On third downs) "I think that the first half when you limit a team to minimal points you have to take advantage. I think that end zone interception should have been a touch back, but nobody cares about coulda woulda shoulda. You leave it up to humans and there will be human error. At the end of the day, we have to find the way to win the games you are supposed to win."

S TYRANN MATHIEU

(On getting things going on defense when the offense is struggling) "For the most part, it's a pressure that you invite. Obviously, we take great pride in helping our offense out. I feel like for the most part that the games are tight and then defensively we miss a tackle or give up a touchdown. Now, we are looking at two score game. I think defensively we have our fair share of responsibility."

(On the frustration of the loss) "It's tough. Obviously, these are two games we feel like we should have one. Coming into both of those games I felt like we were the better team. It's the NFL, so you have to find a way to show up and minimize your mistakes. Defensively, we have to find a way to take the football away and execute. Obviously, those guys executed better than us."

(On Baker Mayfield's ability to escape) "The last three weeks we have been playing quarterbacks that aren't stationary. They are guys that can move the pocket and find rush lanes. We just have to do a better job defensively. We are playing tight coverage on the back end, so those guys are going to have more time to hold the ball. Last week at Green Bay (Jordan) Love was able to extend some drives with his legs. We just have to find a way to match that coverage and match that front and play well enough for four quarters."

QB DEREK CARR

(On if he was 100% today) "I don't think anyone is 100% after week one. There is no excuse for us playing the way that we did today. We have to be better and we will be better."

(On if the shoulder injury affected some throws) "I don't know if it is that or me trying to get more practice reps. Whatever I have to do, then I'll do it. I just don't want the shoulder to be an excuse for the way that we executed today."

(On the biggest detriment today) “There’s a couple of things that we talked about as an offense. Obviously, you know how I am. I keep a lot of those things in close. I felt like the second half we came in with the right mindset of how poorly we did in the first half. This is what we are going to do and this is how we are going to do it. We just need to play consistently right now. It’s too inconsistent as far as the standard that we set for ourselves. The inconsistency is not going to get you a lot of wins in this league especially against a good team like that. We have to get it right and right now. Yes, there is a lot of football ahead. Yes, there is a lot of games. Our focus is right now. We have to fix it now.”

(On if he is surprised by the offense struggling like this through four games) “Yes, very, but we will get it right.”

(On what hasn’t clicked for him so far) “You know me. I keep them conversations and corrections in close. For me, I can say there are a couple of things that we have talked about that we are addressing, are going to work at and get better. It’s not like we don’t know. We are locked in We are focused. We have got to get better, but we have got to get better faster at this pace.”

(On what he expects from the leadership this week) “We are going to bring it. We are already talking about it. Fresh after you want to address...how was the week? How was the game? All of the things that we talked about. I expect us to come ready to work.”

(On having Alvin Kamara back) “Absolutely, Alvin is an unbelievable player. I just wish I could have gotten it to him in different ways or better. He is fun to watch play.”

BUCCANEERS HEAD COACH TODD BOWLES

(On the defensive performance) “They played great and did a heck of a job punching the ball out right there. We didn’t play well Monday night, and we wanted to come back and regain ourselves. A lot of guys stepped up for injured guys. A lot of injured guys played and they played well as a group and as a team. I thought it was a great team win for us.”

(On Mike Evans’ injury) “Not yet. (Mike Evans) just tweaked it (hamstring) right now. We will see how serious it is or isn’t once we get out of here and once they run some more tests on it. I thought the guys that came in, stepped up – (Deven) Thompkins, Trey (Palmer), (Rakim) Jarrett – all those guys stepped up in the decision.”

(On the aggressive offensive play calling) “We wanted to be a lot more aggressive. We were trying to take what they gave us. If they crowded for the run, we threw it. If they tried to take away the pass, we ran it. It was a good balance with that.”

(On preparing for the Saints QB whether it would be Derek Carr or Jameis Winston) “No, because the scheme is the scheme. They both can throw the ball pretty well. We kind of knew what the offense was with (Alvin) Kamara coming back. It’s a very talented group over there. We know we have to see them again.”

(On being 3-1 going into the bye) “It’s great to come back with a win. Again, it’s only the first quarter of the season. 3-1 is good, better than 1-3. We have to get some guys nursed up. We have to scheme some things up, iron some things out there, but we are morphing into kind of a physical tough team that’s hard to beat. We just have to continue that without the mistakes.”

(On the performance of Baker Mayfield) “Tough. He made some throws – long ones and short ones. He made some throws. He stayed away from sacks for the most part, almost gave away a pick, but it came incomplete. We did not count that one. He played a heck of a ballgame. Baker is tough. He fits in here. He understands the offense very well. The guys love to play for him. He works for us.”

(On his concern with the hit Mayfield took early in the game) “You’re always concerned when your quarterback gets hit. He’s tough. He got up, and he fought it out. He’s got two weeks. Hopefully, he can heal up and a lot of other guys, too.”

(On the penalties) “Definitely, always too much for our liking, but they fought. They weren’t going to play a perfect game. There were some penalties that happened that they called that we can’t do anything about, but we can get better at that going forward.”

(On the intensity of this NFC South matchup emotionally) “I thought the older guys did a great job all week, trying to keep things under wraps. Tristan (Wirfs) is not old, but he’s a vet and has played down here along with Lavonte (David), Devin (White), Baker (Mayfield), Mike (Evans), Chris (Godwin). Those kinds of guys did a lot of good things, not having the young guys worried about making mistakes and looking back. We made a mistake; we played full speed. They played through them, and we came out on top.”

BUCCANEERS PLAYER QUOTES

QB BAKER MAYFIELD

(On the first half play where he was almost injured) “It was pretty scary to be honest with you. Just getting pinned down was a scary moment; and, obviously, a late hit kind of on top of that. Luckily, it wasn’t worse than it was, so thank God for that.”

(On the game plan to attack the Saints defense) “Yeah, just take advantage of one-on ones (and) just trusting our guys. I think you saw that throughout the game. Obviously, it was unfortunate to lose Mike (Evans) during the game, but our young guys are playing well. I think you saw that first hand. Chris (Godwin) stepped up in a big way. I still need to get him a touchdown. I underthrew him right before the half. It was just a bad throw on the interception; and, on that late fade ball right before we scored to DT (Deven Thompkins), just trying to get into the end zone. Everybody is playing well.”

(On his good play this season) “It’s a great team. Everybody is on the same page. Everybody is doing their job. It comes down to little details when you’re playing against a good team like that. Obviously, you would like to have that one throw back today. That was a physical error. That wasn’t anything mental. It was just a bad throw. We can correct those.”

(On what this does for the team’s confidence to be 3-1 entering the bye week) “It’s good for us. An early bye...it’s going to be a grind down the stretch for us, but looking at how we are at injury-wise, it’s coming at a good time. Momentum-wise, having a good division win against a good, physical opponent, this couldn’t have come at a better time for us.”

(On how the team adapts to find a way to move the ball after an injury happens) “It comes down to everybody paying attention in meetings, practice, the next man up mentality and everybody being on the same page when it comes down (to it). Everybody is on the same page no matter who is in there. You have to know your job and do it at a high level. Our young guys did that at the same time today as our veterans.”

(On the offense getting into a groove) “We were finally able to get into a groove. It’s just a matter of us getting that first drive going. The first one, I think, was a six play drive. We hurt ourselves a little bit. We were finally able to get into a rhythm. That’s when we can dial it up. The guys were on the same page. You see all the different, unique plays, but we practice those. We just have to be able to do the simple little things right to be able to get into that rhythm.”

(On scrambling more today) “There was a couple (plays) there. Early on in the game, Thad Lewis pointed out that they (Saints) are not accounting for me. That last third down right before Chase

(McLaughlin) hit the long field goal, Dave (Canales) was telling me that we just need five yards right here, so we were looking for, obviously, to convert the first down and just getting it into field goal range. Chase has been consistent for us, so just getting him into range.”

(On if he takes it personally if the defense does not account for him) “No, I don’t take it personally. I’m not the athlete that our skill players are. I know better than that.”

(On what the 3-1 record says about the Bucs) “It shows the accountability within our building, knowing when to do your job and not letting any outside noise affect us. So, now the narrative is going to flip. We have to keep that mindset even more so. We can’t change whether people are patting you on the back or talking trash about you. We’ve known all along what we have in the building. We have been saying that since the offseason. We just have to keep getting better and better. That was the first complementary football game that we’ve had. It was a good one.”

(On winning without Mike Evans in a tough division rivalry and what it says about the team) “We are never out of the fight. I think that we are a team with very strong-minded men; and just (our coaching) staff in general, they are going to put people in position to win and make plays. I just can’t say enough about our defense at the same time. Nine points against that offense as well; that’s incredible. And, they had Alvin (Kamara) back as well, so kudos to our guys on the defensive side of the ball. We just played well as a unit.”

(On putting up points against the stout Saints defense) “Today shows us that if we do the little things right, what we are capable of doing. I mentioned it after the Eagles game, that’s a very good defense as well. We missed it on that one. We didn’t do the little things right. A good defense is going to take advantage of it, but, today, it was a different story.”

(On what it was like witnessing the division rivalry) “Obviously, not having Mike (Evans) there, I think there was a little less drama, but there was still some trash talk going back and forth. You love it. It is a passionate rivalry, whether they (Saints) want to say it or not. It is a physical game when we play New Orleans.”

WR CHRIS GODWIN

(On what he does and how his role changes after Mike Evans exits the game) “It doesn’t really change my role too much. I think more than anything else, it provides opportunities for the younger guys in our room. They did a phenomenal job stepping up and making the plays that came their way. It’s no surprise to us or anyone else on the team. They work their asses off, so I couldn’t be happier for them.”

(On Deven Thompkins) “DT is probably one of the more explosive people that I have ever been around. Day in and day out, he does some things that, I look at him, and I’m like....”

(On breaking the Saints streak of not allowing more than 20 points in 11 straight game) “I didn’t know that, to be honest. I guess it’s a cool thing. For us, I think it’s more important that we got the win. It’s a big divisional game, especially coming in here in a hostile environment and getting the victory. It is three straight (against them), so I think we are doing some pretty good things. It is still a lot of room for improvement.”

(On the team's confidence and leading the division) "If we were listening to everything that everyone outside of the building was saying, why even strap it up? I think the good thing about the people that we have in our building is that we are only worried about what we can control. We understand that we have to go out there and play the games. It's up to us. We have to go out and put the work in and then go out and prove it on the field. Through the first month of the season, being 3-1, I think it's a good spot. Like I said, I think we have a lot of room for improvement, but I am excited about where we are going."

(On Baker Mayfield) "He's a fighter. (He's got) a ton of resilience. I think that he has been a great fit for us. You see him making plays scrambling. He takes some big shots and pops back up. I think that he is a leader, and I think that he loves ball, and I think that that permeates through him. It's infectious for guys on the team. It makes the offensive line want to block more. It makes us want to run our routes a little bit harder and give him a chance because we know that he is going to extend the play as much as he can to give us a chance. I am happy to have him."
