**THE MATCHUP**

The New Orleans Saints, currently in second place in the NFC South at 5-3 in the middle of a 17-game regular season will go on the road for two consecutive weeks, starting when they play the Tennessee Titans (7-2) on Sunday at Nissan Stadium in Nashville, Tenn. This inter-conference conference is a new feature of the league's 17-game schedule, creating a matchup between 2020's two first place teams in the NFC South and AFC South.

New Orleans is 6-8-1 all-time against the Titans/Houston Oilers franchise, with the series between the clubs being very hotly contested with seven being determined by six points or less, including two of the last three meetings. New Orleans, who has a 3-1 road record in 2021, has a 4-2-1 mark in matchups away from their home stadium in the series.

New Orleans is coming off a 27-25 loss to the Atlanta Falcons on Sunday at the Caesars Superdome. New Orleans fell behind 24-6 in the contest with 10:39 remaining, as the Falcons took advantage of a sack/forced fumble by OLB **James Vaughters** that was returned 32 yards to the Saints six-yard line by OLB **Steven Means** to set up the second touchdown connection between **Matt Ryan** and

Falcons WR **Olamide Zaccheaus** on the afternoon.

However New Orleans showed great persistence in rebounding from the grim deficit to score 19 unanswered points to take the lead with 1:01 remaining in the contest for the first time. Upon Atlanta's final touchdown of the afternoon, Saints QB **Trevor Siemian** engineered an eight-play, 66-yard drive that ended with a five-yard touchdown pass to second-year WR **Marquez Callaway**. New Orleans then forced a quick three-and-out and the Falcons were assessed a 15-yard unnecessary roughness penalty on the punt return. Siemian then guided New Orleans on a six-play, 54-yard drive that ended with a two-yard rushing touchdown by RB **Alvin Kamara**. Sacks by defensive ends **Marcus Davenport** and **Cameron Jordan** quickly gave the Saints the ball back, powered by a 26-yard punt return by WR/RS **Deonte Harris**. Five plays later, Siemian completed an eight-yard touchdown to WR **Kenny Stills** to put New Orleans up 25-24 following an unsuccessful two-point conversion attempt.

However elation turned to heartbreak as Falcons Ryan completed a pass for a 64-yard gain to Falcons RB **Cordarrelle Patterson** with 47-seconds left to set up an easy 29-yard field goal by K **Younghoe Koo** and allow Atlanta to leave the Crescent City with the win.

SERIES HISTORY

The New Orleans Saints and the Tennessee Titans, who were the Houston Oilers from 1960-96 have met 15 times. New Orleans has posted a 6-8-1 record all-time against the Titans. Seven of the outcomes in the series have been decided by a touchdown or less. The Saints won the last meeting a 38-28 win at Nashville's Nissan Stadium on December 22, 2019 when wide receiver **Michael Thomas** set the NFL's single-season record for receptions, while running back **Alvin Kamara** returned to the state where he played college football and had 110 total yards from scrimmage and two touchdowns.

The Saints first met Sunday's opponent in 1971 and played to a 13-13 tie with the Oilers in Houston's Astrodome. The Oilers captured the next two games in the series, before the Saints won their first game in the series in 1981 as Head Coach Bum Phillips exacted revenge on his former team. This was the start of a three-game winning streak, including a 24-10 win in 1987 that would ensure the Saints a home playoff game in their seventh straight victory in the season where the club would both finish with a winning record and qualify for the postseason for the first time. The two clubs split their next two meetings. The Titans then went on to capture four straight before the Saints win in 2011. The Saints have posted a 4-2-1 record against the Titans in road contests, including three played at Nissan Stadium in Nashville. New Orleans will be looking for their third consecutive road win at the Titans.

In the 15 games of the New Orleans-Tennessee series there has been:

- 321 points scored by New Orleans, 341 allowed.
- A three-game New Orleans winning streak from 1981-87.
- A four-game winning streak for the Titans/Oilers from 1996-2007.
- A 4-2-1 record for the Saints in road contests in the series, 2-1 since the Titans moved to Tennessee from Houston.
- Eight games decided by double-digits.
- Seven games decided by seven points or less.
- One tie and three games decided by three points.
- A 17-point win by New Orleans (9/30/84) - Biggest Saints win.
- Two 17-point losses by New Orleans (11/10/96 and 9/24/03) - Biggest Saints losses.

LAST MEETING

Saints 34, Tennessee Titans 28; December 22, 2019 @ Nissan Stadium – The Saints, behind a balanced offense, a record-breaking performance from WR **Michael Thomas** and a rebound by a defense that faced early schedules knocked down the Titans, 38-28. With the win, the Saints reached 12 wins for the second consecutive season for the first time in franchise history and gained ground in the race for a first-round postseason bye.

After falling behind 14-0 in the first quarter and experiencing some early struggles on offense, New Orleans scored touchdowns on four consecutive full possessions in the second and third quarters. QB **Drew Brees** completed 27-of-38 passes for 279 yards, with 11 of his throws and a 20-yard completion from QB **Taysom Hill** going into the hands of Thomas, who set the NFL single-season record for receptions, standing at 145 by the end of the contest. His catches went for 136 yards and one touchdown as his 1,688 yards are the tenth-highest total in league record books. The New Orleans running game was led by RB **Alvin Kamara**, who carried 11 times for 80 yards (7.3 avg.) on the day.

A hard-hitting New Orleans defense finished with five sacks, including a career-high two by LB **A.J. Klein**. When the Titans got the ball back from a failed fake punt attempt late in the fourth quarter at their 38-yard line, rookie S **C.J. Gardner-Johnson** tackled Tennessee WR **Kalif Raymond**, forced the football out and returned it 37 yards to the Titans 25-yard line in what would lead to New Orleans' final touchdown to seal the win.

- Linebacker **Demario Davis** led the team with a game-high 11 tackles and a sack as he reached the century mark in stops for the second consecutive season.
- CB **P.J. Williams** moved to the safety position after **Marcus Williams** was forced to depart with a groin injury midway through the contest, playing the position for the first time since high school.
- WR/RS **Deonte Harris**, fresh off being the first Saints rookie to be signed as an undrafted free agent to be selected to the Pro Bowl, sparked the New Orleans return game, bringing back four kickoffs for a career-high 150 yards (37.5 avg.), including a 470-yard runback and also brought back four punts for 21 yards for a career-high 171 all-purpose yards.

Mike Vrabel were teammates with the Pittsburgh Steelers on their special teams units from 1997-98...New Orleans quarterback **Trevor Siemian** spent part of the 2020 season on the Titans practice squad before joining the Saints active roster in November. Siemian and Titans linebacker **Joe Jones** were college teammates at Northwestern and teammates with the Denver Broncos in 2017...Saints cornerback **Bradley Roby** was tutored by Titans Secondary Coach **Anthony Midget** with the Houston Texans in 2019...Titans Inside Linebackers Coach **Jim Haslett** served as linebackers coach of the Saints in 1995, defensive coordinator in 1996 and returned to serve as head coach from 2000-2005, where he was 2000 AP NFL Coach of the Year and led New Orleans to the franchise's first playoff victory...Tennessee Quarterbacks Coach **Pat O'Hara** was head coach of the Arena Football League's New Orleans Voodoo from 2012-14...Titans cornerback **Janoris Jenkins** played for New Orleans from 2019-20...New Orleans Defensive Coordinator **Dennis Allen** had Tennessee Defensive Line Coach **Terrell Williams** on his staff when he was head coach in Oakland from 2012-14. Saints Special Teams Coordinator **Darren Rizzi** and Williams also served on the same coaching staff with the Dolphins from 2015-17...Saints Offensive Analyst **Jim Chaney** served as offensive coordinator at the University of Tennessee from 2009-12 and from 2016-17...Titans fullback **Tory Carter** was a member of the 2019 College Football Playoff national champion team with LSU...Titans running back **Adrian Peterson** played for New Orleans in 2017...New Orleans safety **Malcolm Jenkins** and Titans wide receiver **Marcus Johnson** were teammates with the Philadelphia Eagles in 2017...New Orleans running back **Mark Ingram II** and Titans wide receiver **Julio Jones**, who prepped at Foley (Al.) High School were college teammates at the University of Alabama. Ingram and Tennessee long snapper **Morgan Cox** were teammates in Baltimore from 2019-20...New Orleans Offensive Assistant **D.J. Williams** and Tennessee wide receiver/return specialist **Chester Rogers** were teammates at Grambling State...Saints defensive back **Jeff Heath** and Titans tight end **Geoff Swaim** were teammates with the Dallas Cowboys...Titans cornerback **Elijah Molden** is the son former New Orleans cornerback **Alex Molden** who was a first round pick of the Saints in 1996 and played for them from 1996-2000...New Orleans Vice President/Asst. General Manager/College Personnel **Jeff Ireland** selected Tennessee QB **Ryan Tannehill** in the first round of the 2012 NFL Draft as general manager of the Miami Dolphins...Titans Executive Vice President/General Manager **Jon Robinson** served on the Nicholls State coaching staff from 1999-2001...Titans Director of Pro Scouting **Brian Gardner** is a New Orleans native who played at Nicholls State and also served as defensive coordinator/director of pro personnel of the Arena Football League's New Orleans Night...New Orleans guard/center **Calvin Throckmorton** and Tennessee safety **Brian Breeze** were college teammates at the University of Oregon.

THE HEAD COACHES

Sean Payton has posted a 157-92 overall record (.631), including a 9-8 postseason mark after the franchise had won only one playoff game prior to his arrival in 2006. Payton holds the club's top victory total and winning percentage. Payton is ranked 22nd all-time in National Football League records in victories, fifth among active coaches. He continues to represent the Saints as the model of stability not only within the NFC South, as he is the longest tenured head coach within the conference, but also among the most accomplished within the NFL. Only Bill Belichick (2000) has been with his team longer than Payton's 15 seasons. Payton is also one of just eight active NFL head coaches to lead a team to a Super Bowl victory. The others are the Tampa Bay Buccaneers' Bruce Arians, Belichick, the Seattle Seahawks' Pete Carroll, the Baltimore Ravens' John Harbaugh, the Dallas Cowboys' Mike McCarthy (Green Bay in 2010), Kansas City's Andy Reid and Tomlin. The 2020 Saints were only the sixth team in National Football League history to have six-game winning streaks in four consecutive seasons and with a nine-game winning streak had won at least nine straight games in two of the past three seasons and had double-digit victory figures and consecutive playoff berths in four straight years for the first time in team history, also being only the third NFC team since divisional alignment to capture four straight division championships. The Black and Gold qualified for the NFL playoffs for the ninth season (2006, 2009-11, 2013, 2017-20) in Payton's head coaching tenure). Payton earned a degree in communications at Eastern Illinois, where as a quarterback he had 10,665 passing yards, at the time the third-highest total in NCAA Division I-AA history. Payton was inducted into the Eastern Illinois Hall of Fame in 2000 and had his jersey retired in a ceremony in 2010. He received an honorary doctorate from his alma mater in 2013. Payton was born December 29, 1963 in San Mateo, Calif., and raised in Naperville, Ill., Payton has a daughter, Meghan and a son, Connor.

Mike Vrabel became the 19th head coach in franchise history on Jan. 20, 2018 and has posted a career record of 38-23, including leading the Titans to a 7-2 mark, first place in the AFC South in 2021. Vrabel enters eight year as a National Football League coach and fourth as head coach of the Titans, in addition to three years as a college assistant coach. He led Tennessee to an 11-5 record and the AFC South title in 2020, the franchise's second consecutive playoff berth. Vrabel led the Titans to nine wins in 2018, tying for the fourth-highest total in franchise history by a first-year head coach. The Titans were the least penalized NFL team in 2018 (82). The defense finished eighth overall (333.4), second in the red zone (44.7) and third in scoring defense (18.9). Prior to coming ot Tennessee, Vrabel pent four seasons coaching the Houston Texans, as

linebackers coach (2014-16) and defensive coordinator (2017). Texans won two division titles (2015, 2016) during his tenure. In 2017, Vrabel led the Houston defense to the fifth-best third-down percentage in the National Football League, allowing a franchise-record 3.97 yards per carry, and had 18 different players record at least half a sack. Between 2014-16, the Texans defense ranked first in the NFL in third down defense (33.6), third in yards allowed (319.9) and third in net passing yards (218.4). The 2016 defense ranked number one in the NFL for the first time in franchise history, in yards allowed (301.3). Vrabel was a defensive lineman for the Ohio State Buckeyes (1993-96). He earned back-to-back All-American honors and was twice named Big Ten Conference Defensive Lineman of the Year (1995 and 1996). Third-round 1997 draft pick of the Pittsburgh Steelers (1997-2000) and played for the New England Patriots (2001-08) and Kansas City Chiefs (2009-10). With the Patriots, he earned Pro Bowl and first-team All-Pro honors in 2007 and was a member of three Super Bowl Championship squads. Coached collegiately at Ohio State (2011-13) following retirement from his pro playing career. Born August 14, 1975 in Akron, Ohio. Vrabel and his wife, Jennifer, are the parents of two sons, Tyler and Carter.

GAME SUMMARIES

Week 1: Saints 38, Packers 3; September 12, 2021 @ TIAA Bank Field (Jacksonville, Fla.) – Jameis Winston and the hurricane-displaced Saints looked right at home in northeast Florida — no doubt to the delight of fans rebuilding homes and lives back in New Orleans.

Winston passed for five touchdowns, New Orleans intercepted reigning NFL Most Valuable Player Aaron Rodgers twice, and the Saints kicked off the post-Drew Brees era with a strikingly dominant 38-3 victory over the Green Bay Packers.

"We knew that even though some people don't have power, they're going to find a way to watch the Saints," linebacker and captain Demario Davis said. "That's just what this team means to the city — and the city means the same to us."

The game, originally scheduled for the Superdome, was moved while the New Orleans area continues to clean up wreckage left by Hurricane Ida, which struck southeast Louisiana as a Category 4 storm on Aug. 29, 16 years to the day after Hurricane Katrina devastated the same region.

After canceling their final preseason game and practicing two weeks in the Dallas area, the Saints looked as sharp and inspired as any club with such distractions could have hoped.

"That was for the city," Winston said. "We did that for them. We knew how much it would mean to get a great victory for that region. They've been through so much. ... Hats off to them for their resilience, because they motivated us. They inspired us to come out there and ball."

Winston, who led the NFL with 30 interceptions in his last season as a starter with Tampa Bay in 2019, was largely judicious and accurate in going an efficient 14 of 20 for 148 yards without an interception. New Orleans also rushed for 171 yards.

"Drew always preached, it's about the decision, not the result," Winston said, alluding to last season, when he served as a reserve and understudy to Brees in an effort to improve the long-term trajectory of his up-and-down career. "Sometimes the decision is throwing the ball away, sometimes the decision is running, tucking. Sometimes the decision may be taking a sack."

Winston didn't take a sack, but did take off and run for a few key third-down conversions in the first half.

The only risky throw that backfired on him, a deflected pass caught by Packers defensive back Darnell Savage in the end zone — was negated by a contested roughing-the-passer penalty called against edge rusher Z'Darius Smith.

The penalty set up the second touchdown catch of the game by Juwan Johnson, who came in with four career catches and was converted from receiver to a tight end this offseason.

On the day before his 25th birthday, Johnson also converted a screen pass into a 12-yard, first-down gain on fourth-and-7 in the second quarter, when the game was still

in doubt. He capped that drive with a leaping catch in the end zone on fourth-and-two. The two fourth down conversions highlighted a pivotal 14-play drive that consumed 10 minutes.

"You've got to pick your spots where you want to be aggressive and it's a little bit easier on that end of the field," Payton said. "I felt pretty good about the calls."

Green Bay fans seemed to outnumber Saints fans in a crowd announced at 35,242 for what was officially a Saints home game. But they left disappointed in a day that could not have gone much worse for Rodgers, who was pulled with nearly 11 minutes left.

As the time expired, the remaining Saints fans joined in triumphant chants of "Who Dat!" that echoed throughout the stadium.

"This is a good kick in the you-know-where," said Rodgers, who finished 15 of 28 for 133 yards and no TDs. "We felt like we were going to go up and down the field on whoever they have and that obviously wasn't the case."

Opening the third quarter down 17-3, the Packers squandered a chance to trim their deficit when Rodgers' wobbly pass under pressure was intercepted by rookie defensive back Paulson Adebo at the New Orleans 7 early in the third quarter.

On Green Bay's next drive, Marcus Williams intercepted Rodgers' deep overthrow and returned it to the Packers 12, setting up Winston's 10-yard TD to Chris Hogan.

"Every team has a game like this," said Packers running back Aaron Jones, who was limited to 9 yards on five carries. "It's better to get it out now."

FAST START

The Saints did not punt in the first half.

New Orleans took the opening kickoff for a field goal and led 10-0 after Alvin Kamara took a short forward pitch from Winston as he crossed behind the offensive line, then slipped multiple tackle attempts to squirm into the end zone from 3 yards. That officially went down as Winston's first regular-season TD pass as a Saint, and he helped set it up with a 10-yard scramble on third-and-8.

Week 2: Carolina Panthers 26, Saints 7; September 19, 2021 @ Bank of America Stadium – The Carolina Panthers, a week after their season-opening win over the New York Jets, continued to take advantage of home cooking and handed the Saints a 26-7 defeat on a warm afternoon at Bank of America Stadium.

Carolina quarterback **Sam Darnold** was impressive and efficient throughout the majority of the game, completing 26-of-38 passes for 305 yards with two touchdown passes, one interception and a 99.1 rating. But Darnold wasn't the lone story of the day, as a healthy **Christian McCaffrey** gained 137 total yards from scrimmage and one rushing touchdown.

The Panthers defense seemingly took away most of the Saints' big play abilities, with New Orleans' longest play a 27-yard connection between quarterback **Jameis Winston** and wide receiver **Lil' Jordan Humprey**. New Orleans struggled running the ball (17 carries for 48 yards) and on early downs, resulting in unfavorable situations and production on third down (2-for-11) and losing the time of possession battle 38:32-21:28. **CONTINUED ON NEXT PAGE**

Defensively, LB **Demario Davis** led the club with 12 tackles, while a pair of young defensive linemen in DT **Malcolm Roach** and DE **Payton Turner** recorded their first career interception and sack respectively.

The New Orleans special teams units also worked to keep the Saints in the hunt on a day of tough sledding. P **Blake Gillikin** pinned the Panthers back several times, recording a 45.0 net punting average on six punts with a 60-yard punt. WR **Ty Montgomery** had a career-high three coverage stops. Midway through the third quarter, DE **Carl Granderson**, who had made his first career start on defense, blocked a 55-yard field goal attempt by K **Zane Gonzalez** and it was recovered and returned by LB **Zack Baun**. WR/RS **Deonte Harris** returned five kickoffs for a career-high 156 yards, running back a kick late in the second quarter 39 yards.

Week 3: Saints 28, Patriots 13; September 26, 2021 @ Gillette Stadium – Only one brand of football comes to mind when Jameis Winston thinks about the best New Orleans Saints teams of the past.

"Saints football has always been efficiency and physicality up front," he said. "That's all I know. They win up front and they play tough. That's what we did here."

Winston threw two touchdown passes, Malcolm Jenkins returned an interception for a score, and the Saints beat the Patriots 28-13 on Sunday.

A week after a career-low passer rating Winston showed better command of the offense, completing 13 of 21 passes for 128 yards. Taysom Hill ran for a touchdown and Alvin Kamara rushed 24 times for 89 yards and had a receiving TD. He got support from a defense that made Patriots rookie quarterback's life miserable.

Mac Jones entered the day hoping to stretch the field after two games in which the passing attack was mostly underneath. Instead, he found himself under pressure for most of the day and threw three interceptions, two leading to Saints touchdowns. New Orleans sacked Jones three times and hit him 11 times. He finished 30 of 51 for 270 yards and a touchdown.

"I think it just goes back to execution," Jones said. "I can do a better job just sticking to my reads and being patient and letting things develop. I didn't do a good job of that today." Saints safety P.J. Williams returned Jones' first pick of the day 46 yards to set up a 7-yard TD pass by Winston in the second quarter.

Jenkins was the beneficiary of the second INT, snaring a pass bobbled by tight end Jonnu Smith. He returned it 34 yards and put the Saints in front 21-3.

The Patriots cut it to 21-13 following Jones' 22-yard TD pass to Kendrick Bourne with 9:22 left in the fourth period. The Saints responded with a 13-play, 75-yard drive that ate up 6:45 and ended with a 4-yard run by Hill.

Saints coach Sean Payton harped all week on the Patriots' impressive 108-7 record at home (including playoffs) since 2000 when they win the turnover battle. He said having a plus-3 differential Sunday was huge.

"We're mindful of it every week, but it had to be something that was put in our heads every day," he said. "I thought we

took care of the football. I thought that was important." New Orleans overcame an early injury to take a 14-3 lead into halftime.

The Saints' offensive line was already down one starter with center Erik McCoy (calf) ruled out. They lost another early in the first quarter after left tackle Terron Armstead exited with a left elbow injury.

But after going three-and-out on their opening drive, the Saints got efficient, sweeping down the field mixing runs and passes, and a long third-down conversion to get inside the red zone. Winston then put a bow on the 11-play, 69-yard drive with an 11-yard touchdown pass to Kamara. The Saints turned defense into offense for their second score.

The Patriots had third down near midfield when linebacker Kaden Ellis pressured Jones, forcing a pass that was tipped and intercepted by Williams. He returned it 46 yards to the Patriots 9.

Three plays later Winston connected with Marquez Callaway for a 7-yard touchdown.

"There's no magic sauce here," Belichick said. "Just have to go back to work and do better."

Week 4: Giants 27, Saints 21; October 3, 2021 @ Caesars Superdome – The New York Giants spoiled the New Orleans Saints' Dome-coming party as they won a 27-21 overtime game in the Caesars Superdome.

Down 21-10 with 12 minutes to play quarterback Daniel Jones started the comeback by hitting Barkley on a 54-yard scoring play with 6:52 to play. Jones ran it in for the 2-point conversion to make it 21-18. Jones then led the Giants on a late drive to tie the score at 21 when kicker Graham Gano made a 48-yard field goal with 31 seconds to play. The Giants (1-3) won the coin toss and took the ball to start the 10-minute overtime period and marched down the field, ending it with a powerful run by Barkley. Jones finished 28 of 40 for 402 yards with two touchdown passes and one interception. Barkley had 13 carries for 52 yards and the game-winning touchdown.

The loss dropped the Saints to 2-2 and ruined the team's first game in front of a full home crowd in 637 days. The scheduled home opener was moved to Jacksonville because of damage to the area from Hurricane Ida and the team had been training in Dallas until Sept. 24. The Saints had seemed to be in command of the game thanks to their quarterbacks, Jameis Winston and Taysom Hill.

Winston handled the passing-17 of 23 for 226 yards and a touchdown-while Hill took care of the rushing, powering in for two 8-yard touchdown runs.

The loss ruined one of the best games of RB Alvin Kamara's five-year career. He recorded his fourth 100-yard rushing game, carrying a career-high 26 times for 120 yards. Hill finished with 28 yards on six carries and caught two passes for 26 yards.

GAME SUMMARIES

Week 5: Saints 33, Washington Football Team 22; October 10, 2021 @ FedEx Field

After Jameis Winston connected with Marquez Callaway on a Hail Mary touchdown on the final play of the first half, Sean Payton recalled a similar play in his first season as Saints coach.

15 years ago, his team's Hail Mary in Atlanta overshadowed a halftime performance by country music duo Sugarland. Payton thought to himself: "If there was any halftime entertainment, that's a tough spot to be in."

This one was even sweeter. The Hail Mary was one of Winston's four touchdown passes to help the Saints beat Washington 33-22 for a bounce-back victory.

"Turnovers are going to happen — you just don't want the trickle-down effect to happen," said Winston, who completed 15 of 30 passes for 279 yards and made up for an inexplicable interception on the first possession and a fumble on Chase Young's first sack of the season. "We played efficient football. We made plays when we needed it."

The win came at a cost with two more injuries. Winston took every snap at quarterback for the first time, a necessity after Taysom Hill suffered a concussion.

Winston completed a 72-yard TD pass to Deonte Harris, who departed (hamstring). He also connected with Callaway on the 49-yard Hail Mary TD, found him wide open from 12 yards out early in the fourth quarter and sent Washington fans to the exits with a pass to Alvin Kamara that turned into a 19-yard score. Kamara also had a 23-yard TD run, returned punts in Harris' absence and racked up 151 total yards.

"Any time I'm catching the ball, I love it," said Kamara, who didn't have a reception last week in the overtime loss to the New York Giants. "I think it adds an aspect to our offense. We had an opportunity to do that."

The Saints picked off Taylor Heinicke twice and put some pressure on him a week after not sacking the Giants. Antonio Gibson ran for two TDs, but Washington could not outscore another rough performance by its defense.

Week 7: Saints 13, Seahawks 10; October 25, 2021 @ Lumen Field

Alvin Kamara and Jameis Winston were the happy beneficiaries of the Seahawks' many mistakes. Then it was rookie Brian Johnson's turn to make sure the Saints got the win they needed to keep pace in the NFC South.

"In a game like this where things are close, things get a little a little ugly towards the end, it builds confidence to be able to come into a game like this and close it out the way we did," Saints DE Cameron Jordan said.

Johnson kicked a 33-yard field goal with 1:56 left in his NFL debut, and New Orleans outlasted Seattle 13-10. Kamara carried the load for New Orleans and Winston made a handful of plays when needed, but the Saints escaped Seattle thanks largely to a series of Seahawks blunders, which is sorely missing injured QB Russell Wilson.

Two of the Seahawks' biggest mistakes came on New Orleans' deciding drive when Seattle was flagged for roughing the passer and jumping offside on a long field-goal attempt. Both penalties gave New Orleans first downs, and Johnson's field goal coming out of the 2-minute warning put the Saints ahead.

Johnson, a rookie, made a PAT and both field-goal tries, connecting from 21 yards in the first half.

"It was tough trying to see what the wind was doing because it was changing constantly throughout pregame and the game itself," Johnson said. "So just stick with my plan I had coming into it and really focusing on just hitting my ball and hitting good contact that will cut through the wind."

Geno Smith made his second start at QB for Seattle (2-5) since Wilson suffered a serious finger injury in a loss to the Rams. The backup hit DK Metcalf for an 84-yard touchdown in the first quarter but went nowhere when the Seahawks had a final chance to tie or win.

Smith was sacked on consecutive plays by Malcolm Jenkins and Demario Davis. On fourth-and-28, Smith was pressured again and his throw to Metcalf fell incomplete. Smith went 12 of 22 for 167 yards — half coming on the TD toss to Metcalf — and was sacked five times as Davis, Cameron Jordan and others made his night uncomfortable. Seattle's lost three straight for the first time since 2011 and fell to 0-3 at home for the first time since 1992. Although both defeats with Smith under center have been by three points, the Seahawks aren't the same without Wilson.

"I've been here a long time and if we didn't have Russell, I probably wouldn't have been here a long time because of all the magic he has created over the years," coach Pete Carroll said.

Kamara finished with 10 catches for 128 yards and a 13-yard TD reception late in the first half. It was his fifth career regular-season game with double-digit receptions. He rushed for 51 yards.

Winston was 19 of 35 for 222 yards and added 43 yards rushing. He also made enough plays—thanks to Seattle penalties—to get the Saints in range for the field goal. Seattle appeared to get a stop, but Marquise Blair was called for roughing the passer on a third-down sack after hitting Winston with the crown of his helmet. Kamara then sprinted past a blitz for 12 yards on third-and-10 and the Saints were in field-goal range.

Al Woods jumped offside as Johnson lined up for a 43-yard attempt, allowing New Orleans to burn another 90 seconds off the clock before Johnson made the shorter try.

"We got to get right," Seattle LB Bobby Wagner said.

"We've got to really fix our mistakes, play smarter, make less penalties."

Seattle's Jason Myers missed two field goal attempts — the second into the open end of the stadium after Smith took another costly sack. Myers made a 50-yarder. Kamara had 21 touches on New Orleans' 39 offensive plays in the first half. He was mostly ineffective on the ground, but Seattle couldn't slow him down in the pass game. He already had 108 yards receiving by halftime. Four of his receptions came on the final drive of the half when his 31-yard catch-and-run out of the backfield set up his 13-yard TD catch and a 10-7 halftime lead.

"Every game has a life of its own, so that was just the flavor of this week, ended up getting a lot of touches," Kamara said.

Week 8: Saints 36, Buccaneers 27; October 31, 2021 @

Caesars Superdome - When Saints quarterback Jameis Winston could no longer walk on his own, his New Orleans teammates rose up in dramatic fashion to knock off Tom Brady and the defending champs.

P.J. Williams intercepted Brady and returned it 40 yards for a touchdown with 1:24 left, helping New Orleans seal an eventful but potentially costly 36-27 victory over the Tampa Bay Buccaneers on Sunday.

Winston injured his left knee during a scramble early in the second quarter when pulled down from behind by former LSU star Devin White, who was flagged for a horse collar tackle.

"I think it's significant," said coach Sean Payton, adding that he cried when he saw Winston in the locker room. "He felt something and is on crutches right now. ... When he got up and then had to go back down, you were a little concerned."

Backup Trevor Siemian took over for Winston and completed 16 of 29 passes for 159 yards and a touchdown without a turnover, leading the Saints on five scoring drives that produced two touchdowns and three field goals.

Payton said he had confidence in Siemian, who'd started for Denver in 2016 and 2017. Payton added his play calling for the duration of the game had more to do with how Tampa Bay was defending than the fact that his backup QB was under center.

"He's an experienced player," Payton said.

Siemian, who last took a meaningful snap in Week 2 of the 2019 season with the New York Jets, said he'd "kind of lost a little bit a sense of how fun it is."

"There's a joy to this game," Siemian said. "There's nothing better than to see your teammates make plays and you're moving the ball and it's the best."

Winston's first start against the team that drafted him first overall in 2015, and then let him go in 2020 when they had a chance to sign Brady, was a subplot of this NFC South clash.

And Winston looked determined to do whatever it took to win, passing for 56 yards and a 14-yard touchdown to TreQuan Smith, and scrambling for 40 yards before his injury. Payton gave Winston a game ball, and teammates lamented his injury.

"It was hard, man, because he worked so hard this offseason," said Williams, Winston's friend since they were teammates at Florida State. "It's tough for me, it's tough for the team and I know it's tough for him. I told him at halftime we were going to go out there and win for him." Brady passed for four TDs, but also turned the ball over three times on a pair of interceptions and a fumble, which the Saints converted into 16 points.

The Bucs nearly overcame their mistakes. They wiped out a 16-point second-half deficit and took a lead with 5:44 to go when receiver and former LSU track athlete Cyril Grayson was left uncovered and Brady found him for a 50-yard touchdown.

New Orleans responded by driving for a field goal and a 29-27 lead with 1:41 left, leaving Brady, no stranger to late-game heroics, that much time plus a timeout to get in field

goal range. Instead, the Saints' defense came up big.

"I just threw it to the wrong guy," Brady said of his late interception. "I had Mike (Evans) open. It cost us the game."

MOMENTUM SWINGS

New Orleans' defense came up with two turnovers in the second quarter after Winston was carted to the locker room, and the Saints' offense converted those into nine points.

Brady fumbled on a double-pump caused by pressure from defensive end Cameron Jordan. Defensive tackle David Onyemata, newly activated after a six-game suspension, recovered near midfield.

The Saints got a field goal, but only after a roughing-the-passer call against William Gholston wiped out what would have been an interception by Antoine Winfield Jr. in the end zone.

Later, Brady was intercepted by C.J. Gardner Johnson, who had left his man to undercut a pass intended for Chris Godwin.

New Orleans capitalized by driving for Siemian's 1-yard pass to fullback Alex Armah shortly before halftime.

The Saints widened their lead to 23-7 on the opening possession of the second half, which began with Siemian hitting Kevin White for a 38-yard gain. Alvin Kamara finished it on a pitch play on fourth-and-goal from the 1.

But Brady responded by leading the Bucs to touchdowns on two straight possessions. He hit RB Giovani Bernard for a 7-yard TD and launched a 41-yard scoring strike to Evans, who beat Marshon Lattimore in single coverage.

STAT LINES

For the Bucs, the loss squandered a prolific day for Godwin, who had eight catches for 144 yards, including a 12-yard touchdown in the first quarter.

The Saints rushed for 152 yards — led by Kamara's 61 — against Tampa Bay's top-ranked run defense, which came in allowing 67.4 yards rushing per game.

The Saints sacked Brady three times: one each by Jordan, Kwon Alexander and Tanoh Kpassagnon.

Week 9: Atlanta Falcons 26, Saints 5; November 7, 2021 @ Caesars Superdome - Matt Ryan's last and longest of several deep completions spared the Atlanta Falcons from another infamous collapse.

Ryan hit Cordarrelle Patterson for a 64-yard gain with a minute left to set up Youngbuck Koo's 29-yard field goal as time expired, and Atlanta defeated mistake-prone New Orleans on Sunday after allowing the Saints to wipe out an 18-point, fourth-quarter deficit.

"We just like to give our fans a heart attack, just keep them on their toes to make sure they're paying attention," Patterson joked. "We wanted to put them away early, but it's the Saints; they've got a great team over there. They fought till the end. We did a better job. We got the win, that's all that matters."

Ryan passed for 343 yards, connected twice with Olamide Zaccheaus for touchdowns, and the veteran quarterback also ran for a score on a bootleg as the Falcons (4-4) snapped the Saints' three-game winning streak and prevented New Orleans (5-3) from moving into a tie with Tampa Bay (6-2) atop the NFC South. **CONTINUED ON NEXT PAGE**

"I felt good after that one," Ryan said. "I was excited. We needed to make a play. We needed to win that game. I'm proud of the guys for getting the job done."

Ryan's second scoring pass gave the Falcons a 24-6 lead with 10:39 left in the fourth quarter. But the Saints rallied to briefly take the lead on Trevor Siemian's 8-yard pass to Kenny Stills with 1:01 left.

New Orleans then missed a 2-point conversion try for the second time in the game, leaving the door open for the Falcons to win with a field goal.

"We got it going but it was too little, too late," Siemian said. "You can't spot a team that many scores. I knew there was a lot of time left and the game wasn't over when we scored at the end. You were still holding your breath a little bit."

LOST LEADS

The Falcons have seen their share of blown double-digit leads in recent years — none worse than a Super Bowl loss five seasons ago to the Patriots in overtime after leading 28-3.

The Falcons lost four fourth-quarter leads last season, when they also became the first team in NFL history to lose back-to-back games after leading by 15 or more in the fourth quarter.

And just last December, the Falcons fell to Tampa Bay after leading 24-7.

But against their historical rivals in New Orleans, the Falcons didn't fold. Rather, Ryan pulled off his 41st career comeback.

Ryan needed just one play to burn the Saints' defense for his fourth completion of more than 30 yards in the game — and his second long connection with Patterson. The versatile running back beat rookie Paulson Adebo down the right sideline to give him six catches for 126 yards on the day.

"That's 'Matty Ice,'" Patterson said. "He's not nervous, he's been doing this his whole career."

STATS AND SUCH

Even with top Falcons receiver Calvin Ridley unavailable while addressing mental health issues, Ryan completed 23 of 30 passes without a turnover. Russell Gage caught seven passes for 64 yards, rookie tight end Kyle Pitts caught three for 62 yards and Zaccheaus caught three for 58 yards.

Saints head coach Sean Payton started Siemian on the heels of Jameis Winston's season-ending knee injury a week ago, and intermittently mixed in Taysom Hill behind center.

Siemian passed for 249 yards and two touchdowns without an interception, and Hill completed both of his passes for 33 yards. But both quarterbacks were hindered by a combination of penalties, dropped passes and protection breakdowns.

"They played better than us today," Payton said of the Falcons. "We didn't do the things that winning teams do consistently in our league, and we've got to get that corrected."

James Vaughters' blind-side sack and strip of Siemian set up Atlanta's final TD after linebacker Steven Means recovered and returned the fumble 32 yards to the New Orleans 6.

But New Orleans rallied for three straight TDs in the final eight minutes, starting with Siemian's 5-yard pass to Marquez Callaway and Alvin Kamara's 2-yard scoring run with 4:35 to go.

The Saints failed on a 2-point try after Kamara's touchdown, but New Orleans sacked Ryan for the first two times all game to force a punt and set up its late, go-ahead possession.

"You'd love to have a comfortable lead. Everybody wants to be comfortable," Falcons first-year coach Arthur Smith said. "That's not the NFL, not when you're on the road playing a good team."

"Our mindset has been we're going to finish games," Smith

added. "This shows more about their mental toughness."

Offensive Assistant D.J. Williams - Father, Doug Williams, is a veteran of the Washington Football Team's front office, who won Super Bowl XXII as their starting quarterback, the pinnacle of a storied 12-year pro football career, which includes him being in the Tampa Bay Buccaneers Ring of Honor, also working in the Buccaneers front office.

Vice President/Asst. General Manager-College Personnel Jeff Ireland – Stepson of Chiefs Hall of Fame LB/C E.J. Holub. Grandson of Philadelphia Eagles running back and Chicago Bears personnel exec. Jim Parmer.

National Scout Terry Wooden - Brother, JoJo, is Director of Player Personnel for the Los Angeles Chargers.

Linebacker Demario Davis - Late cousin Steve McNair was a former standout quarterback for the Houston Oilers/Tennessee Titans (1995-2005) and Ravens (2006-07).

Quarterback Taysom Hill - Brother-in-law, David Nixon played linebacker and on special teams for the Oakland Raiders (2009), Houston Texans (2010) and St. Louis Rams (2010-11).

Linebacker Kaden Elliss - Father, Luther was a former first round draft pick of the Lions in 1995 and played ten years in the NFL and was selected to two Pro Bowls. Younger brother Christian, signed with the Minnesota Vikings after the 2021 NFL Draft and went to training camp with the team.

Linebacker Chase Hansen - Uncle, Bruce, played in six games at running back and on special teams for the New England Patriots in 1987.

Defensive End Cameron Jordan - Father, Steve, had a prolific 13-year career at tight end for the Vikings, with six Pro Bowl selections, being inducted into their Ring of Honor.

Tight end Juwan Johnson - Brother George, played defensive end for eight years in the National Football League with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, Vikings, Lions and Saints.

Tackle Jordan Mills - Has two cousins with extensive National Football League experience. Brandon Jacobs was a 4th-round pick (110th overall) by the New York Giants in the 2005 NFL draft and played nine NFL seasons with the Giants (2005-11;2013) and San Francisco 49ers (2012) as a running back. Tramon Williams, also a former Louisiana Tech standout, was signed as an undrafted free agent by the Houston Texans in 2006 and played 14 NFL seasons with the Green Bay Packers (2007-14; 2018-19), Cleveland Browns (2015-16), Arizona Cardinals (2017) and Baltimore Ravens (2020) as a cornerback before finally announcing his retirement this past offseason.

Wide Receiver Kenny Stills - Father, Ken Stills was an eighth round draft pick of the Green Bay Packers in 1985 and played for the Packers (1985-89) and Minnesota Vikings (1990).

Defensive Tackle Shy Tuttle - Uncle, Perry Tuttle played wide receiver on Clemson's national championship team in 1981, who was a first round pick of the Bills in 1982 and then played three NFL seasons with the Buffalo Bills, Atlanta Falcons and Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

Linebacker Pete Werner - Father, Greg, played two years in the NFL with the New York Jets and Philadelphia Eagles.

Senior Scouting Consultant Scott Campbell - Late father, Marion, played for the San Francisco 49ers (1954-55) and Philadelphia Eagles (1956-61) as one of the league's last two-way players along the line as a two-time Pro Bowl selection and first-team All-Pro (1960), was a defensive assistant with the New England Patriots (1962-63), Minnesota Vikings (1964-66), Los Angeles Rams (1967-68), Eagles (1977-82) and Atlanta Falcons (1969-74) and former head coach of the Eagles (1983-85) and Falcons (1987-89).

Area Scout Joey Vitt - Father, Joe Vitt, is a longtime National Football League assistant coach, who served as assistant head coach/linebackers of the Saints from 2006-16 and also had coaching stints with the Seattle Seahawks, Colts, Los Angeles/St. Louis Rams, Kansas City Chiefs and Jets.

Combine Scout Matt Phillips - Father, Ted is the president/CEO of the Chicago Bears.

Finishing the 2020 regular season at 12-4, New Orleans has won at least ten games for the ninth time under Payton after posting double-digit win totals only five times from 1967-2005. In 2020, the Saints had the franchise's seventh season of at least 12 wins, five under Payton.

IN THE NFC SOUTH

The Saints have the best record among NFC South teams since 2006, a time where they've won seven division titles including four straight from 2017-20, the most in division history and are only the third NFC team since 2002 to win a division four straight times. They've posted a 58-35 division mark since 2006 and in 2020 became the first team since the NFC South debuted in 2002 to finish the season 6-0 in the division. PAYTON'S PLACE AMONG HEAD COACHES

Sean Payton's had an impressive run as head coach since being hired. After the team had captured only two division titles prior to 2006, the club has seven under Payton, including four straight from 2017-20, the first time the club won their division in consecutive seasons and only the third time an NFC team's won their division four straight seasons since 2002 realignment. The franchise has had 15 winning seasons in its 55-season history, nine under Payton's watch. Of the players currently on the Saints' active roster, 41 were on the active roster, a reserve list or the practice squad at the end of 2020. 26 have less than four years of prior NFL experience. The following's a breakdown of New Orleans' roster by experience (year entering): 13 years-1, 11 years-2, 10 years-1, 9 years-2, 8 years-2, 7 years-2, 6 years-3, 5 years-8, 4 years-4, 3 years-7, 2 years-9, 1 year-3 rookies-7.

PRACTICE MAKES PERFECT

A spot on the practice squad is another avenue to eventually get onto the active roster and have the opportunity to contribute. The Saints have ten players on their current 2021 53-man roster who moved up to their 53-man roster after being on NFL practice squads, all who spent time on the Saints practice roster before being promoted. Below is an overview of players on the club's current 53-man roster with extensive practice squad experience.

After appearing in three regular season games in 2017 with

a four-year catch and posting two receptions for 12 yards and one touchdown in the 2018 NFC Championship game, tight end **Garrett Griffin** was elevated to the club's active roster multiple times in 2020, playing in four games with three starts, serving as a blocking presence and has appeared in all seven in 2021, receiving his first start on Sunday vs. Tampa Bay on October 31, posting a career-high three receptions for 30 yards. Griffin has played an important blocking role in the team's run game, which is ranked tenth in the National Football League.

Running back **Dwayne Washington** participated on the Saints practice squad briefly in 2018 after spending most of the 2016 and 2017 seasons on Detroit's active roster. Through development, the tailback, in addition to his running skills, has developed into a core special teams player with eight stops.

K **Brian Johnson** was signed as an undrafted free agent who went to training camp with Chicago out of Virginia Tech, starting the season on their practice squad. Signed by New Orleans during the bye, Johnson made his NFL regular season debut on Monday night football at Seattle on October 25 and drilled a game-winning 33-yard field goal with 1:56 remaining. On October vs. Tampa Bay, Johnson drilled all three of his field goal attempts, including a kick with 1:41 remaining in the contest to put New Orleans ahead. Overall Johnson has drilled all seven field goal attempts with 11 of his 18 kickoffs sailing through the end zone for touchbacks.

Tight end **Juwan Johnson** was signed by New Orleans out of Oregon, where he spent his graduate transfer season following the 2020 NFL Draft as a wideout. Recording four receptions for 39 yards seven contests, Johnson spent the majority of the season on the practice squad. Converted to tight end in 2021, Johnson's taken advantage of his large frame and participation in his first full offseason strength and conditioning program, posting three receptions for 80 yards in the preseason. the season-opening win over Green Bay, Johnson posted three receptions for 21 yards and two touchdowns. Overall, Johnson has seven receptions for 72 yards with three touchdowns.

After spending the second half of the 2020 season on the practice squad and the 2019 regular season out of football, defensive lineman **Christian Ringo** secured a roster spot in the team's 2021 defensive line rotation. Also having practice squad stints with Detroit, Dallas and Green Bay, Ringo has played in 23 games for five teams and recorded 20 tackles, 1.5 sacks and one forced fumble. Ringo has opened all three games on the interior for New Orleans, posting seven tackles (four solo), while plugging the middle for the NFL's top-ranked run defense.

Ahead is a synopsis of several returning players and newcomers through the draft and free agency to the 2021 Saints offensive line:

LT Terron Armstead - The club's first third round draft choice in 2013 out of Arkansas-Pine Bluff, Armstead impressed scouts by running the fastest 40-yard dash time (4.71) by an offensive lineman in the history of the NFL Scouting Combine. He's opened 91 regular season games and nine postseason contests and has been selected to the Pro Bowl the past three seasons, as well as being selected as the club's 2019 Man of the Year and the team nominee for the NFL's Art Rooney Sportsmanship Award.

RT Ryan Ramczyk - The Black and Gold used their second first round selection in the 2017 NFL Draft to snag Ramczyk out of Wisconsin, one of the best linemen in the entire draft. After opening all 16 games and both postseason contests in 2017 and being selected as a PFWA All-Rookie, he was an AP All-Pro selection in 2018, not missing an offensive snap in both postseason contests and all 15 regular games. Ramczyk opened all 16 games in 2019 to serve as a dominating bookend to Armstead, earning first-team All-Pro. Opening every contest and playing a key role in blocking for a run offense that averaged over 200 yards per game in a three-game stretch for the first time since 2018 in three contests and finished ranked sixth in the league in rushing offense. In 2020, he was selected as a second-team AP All-Pro. **CONTINUED ON NEXT PAGE**

OFFENSIVE NOTES

Center/Guard Erik McCoy - New Orleans traded up in the second round of the 2019 NFL Draft to select this standout from Texas A&M, who was a three-year starter, anchoring the middle of the Aggies offensive line. In 2018, he was a team captain who paved the way for the SEC's leading rusher and in 2019 was the first Saint in franchise history to start at center in Week One, opening all 16 regular season contests. McCoy opened all 16 contests and both postseason games in 2020 for the NFL's sixth-ranked rushing offense. McCoy has started three contests at center in 2021.

Guard/Center Cesar Ruiz - The hard-working, talented and intelligent lineman is a perfect fit for New Orleans' culture with the 24th pick in the 2020 NFL Draft out of Michigan. The three-year letterman played in 36 games in college, starting his last 31 including the final 26 at center, earning All-Big Ten in 2019. Ruiz settled in at right guard in the last 15 games, with nine start, as well as both postseason contests. When McCoy suffered a lower leg injury in the first quarter of the season-opening win over Green Bay, Ruiz transitioned over to his natural position, where the Saints did not give up a sack and has started the past four contests in the middle. He returned to right guard on October 25 at Seattle.

Offensive Lineman Calvin Throckmorton - This 6-5, 309 pound former four-year starter on the Oregon line was signed as an undrafted free agent in 2020, possessing the flexibility to play all five positions along the offensive line. After spending his rookie season on the practice squad, Throckmorton increased strength in the 2021 offseason and made strides in training camp, securing a roster spot. In his NFL debut in the season opening-win, Throckmorton was called to play right guard following a lower leg injury to McCoy in the first quarter, subsequently starting the past four contests. He then moved into left guard on October 25 at Seattle following a shoulder injury to Andrus Peat and has returned to his role as a valuable player with versatility.

T Landon Young - A mainstay at left tackle for his entire college career at Kentucky, Young played in 49 contests with 30 starts in his college career. The Lexington, Ky. native was selected by New Orleans in the sixth round of the 2021 NFL Draft.

T/G James Hurst - An eight-year NFL veteran who was signed as a free agent from Baltimore in 2020, Hurst has 108 career appearances with 54 starts at three different positions on the inside and outside. His versatility came in handy in 2020, as he started two contests at left tackle and one at left guard and the Saints gained over 200 yards rushing each time. Hurst moved into the lineup for three games at left tackle in place of an injured Armstead and has now moved into left guard in place of an injured Peat.

T Jordan Mills - This former Louisiana Tech standout from Napoleonville has played in 90 career regular season games with 84 starts for Chicago, Buffalo and Arizona. In 2021 he has served a valuable role on the line as a top backup for Armstead and Ramczyk.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

DEFENSIVE DRAFTS

Over the last seven drafts from 2015-21, New Orleans has shown a commitment to defense, spending 18-of-32 picks on that side of the ball. With nine picks in 2015, the Saints picked six defensive players, the most taken since New Orleans chose nine in a 12-round selection meeting in 1990. Below is an overview of the defensive players selected by New Orleans from 2015-21 currently with the club:

Cornerback Paulson Adebo, Stanford (D3-21) - Selected in the third round (76th overall) of the 2021 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Adebo finished his college career playing in 22 games with 21 starts and recording 97 tackles, 34 passes defended and eight interceptions, earning All-Pac-12 in 2018 and 2019. He started in the opener and became the first Saint to record an interception in his NFL debut since 2002 with a third quarter pick of Packers QB Aaron Rodgers. Adebo posted his second pick in Week 6 at Washington.

Linebacker Zack Baun, Wisconsin (D3a-20) - Selected in the third round (74th overall) of the 2020 NFL Draft out of the Wisconsin, Baun finished his college career with 154 tackles, 15 sacks, two interceptions, one returned for a TD, six passes defended, three forced fumbles and a fumble recovery. The Saints were attracted to his playmaking ability that he displayed for the Badgers in 2019, when he ranked second in the Big Ten with a 19.5 stops for loss and 12 sacks (second among Power Five linebackers in both categories). Baun has posted four special teams tackles in 2020 and four in 2021, adding 13 defensive stops and a return of a blocked field goal this season.

Defensive Back C.J. Gardner-Johnson, Florida (D4-19) Possessing a combination of instincts and speed, this Florida native was a solid value in the fourth round after playing in all 13 games with 12 starts for the Gators in 2018, when he posted 71 tackles, three sacks and four interceptions with two brought back for touchdowns. Gardner-Johnson appeared in all 16 contests with seven starts as a rookie in 2019, recording 46 tackles (35 solo), an interception, eight passes defended, one forced fumble and a fumble recovery. He finished third on the team with 65 stops in 2020. Gardner-Johnson has 25 stops (17 solo), one sack, a 26-yard interception return and three passes defended this season.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

CB Marshon Lattimore, Ohio State (D1a-17) - The 11th overall selection in the 2017 NFL draft out of Ohio State and the first corner taken possesses all the traits of a lockdown defender. With his agile, fluid style, Lattimore has the ability to shut down the best wide receivers. In 2017, he finished with 53 stops, five picks, to lead NFL rookies and the Saints, tying a team rookie record, a club-best 18 passes defended, a forced fumble and a recovery. Lattimore was the first Saints corner selected to the Pro Bowl since 1995 and selected as *AP* Defensive Rookie of the Year. His five takeaways in 2018 led the team, adding two more picks in the NFC Divisional Playoff win. In 2020, he led the cornerbacks with 63 tackles, two interceptions and ten passes defended as he was selected to his third Pro Bowl. Prior to the start of the regular season, Lattimore was signed by the club to a long-term contract extension. He was named the Week 6 NFC Defensive Player of the Week, recording a career-high six passes defenses at Washington, the league's highest total since 2017.

DE Marcus Davenport, Texas-San Antonio (D1-18) - Davenport joined the Saints with the 14th overall pick in the 2018 NFL Draft after showing potential and production as a pass rusher at Texas-San Antonio. In four seasons, Davenport posted 22 sacks, including 8.5 in 2017 when he captured Conference USA Defensive Player of the Year. Davenport's strength on the line is a valuable asset for the Saints front, posting six sacks in 13 games in 2019. Davenport recorded a sack in the season-opening win over Green Bay and returned from Injured Reserve in Week Seven at Seattle. He posted his first sack since his return last Sunday vs. Atlanta.

DT David Onyemata, Manitoba (D4-16) - Possessing a unique combination of size and speed, this Nigeria native had an impressive rookie year after becoming the first player from the University of Manitoba to be drafted into the NFL. Despite being new to football, the 2016 fourth round draft pick became a critical member on the interior of the Saints defensive front in 2017, playing in all 16 games with six starts, making 40 tackles and two sacks. Overall in his career, he has played in 80 contests with 42 starts, posting 191 stops, 16 sacks, one interception, five passes defended, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery.

DE Payton Turner, Houston (D1-21) - Selected 28th overall in the first round of the 2021 NFL Draft, the Texas native comes off a senior campaign where he posted 10.5 tackles for loss and five sacks in only five contests. During his four collegiate seasons, Turner notched career totals of 115 tackles (68 solo), ten sacks, 25 tackles for loss, one interception, one forced fumble, ten passes defended and one blocked punt. Turner recorded five tackles and a sack in his NFL debut on September 19 at Carolina.

LN Pete Werner, Ohio State (D2-21) - New Orleans selected this three-year starter from Ohio State to compete at the linebacker position. The Indianapolis, Ind. native finished his college career playing in 47 career games with 35 starts, recording 185 tackles (111 solo), 16 stops for loss, four sacks, 11 passes defended, four forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Werner helped power the Buckeyes to the College Football Playoff championship game as a senior in 2020, when he was voted by Big Ten coaches as a first-team All-Conference selection and a Butkus Award semifinalist, posting 54 tackles, 2.5 stops for loss, one sack and two forced fumbles. Werner made his first career start in Week Three and on Oct. 3 vs. the New York Giants had ten tackles. Leading the team with 13 stops in Week 6 at the Washington Football Team, Werner became the first Saints rookie since 2015 to have back-to-back performances of double-digit stops. He ranks fourth on the club with 37 stops on the season.

FS Marcus Williams, Utah (D2-17) - A three-year starter at the University of Utah, Williams was twice named All-Pac 12 and earned second-team All-American as a junior when he tied for second in the conference with five interceptions. The defender boasts a dangerous mix of speed, fluidity, and instinct that allows him to read offenses and make breaks on the football. His athleticism showed in his rookie season in as he made 70 tackles, four interceptions and six passes defended, adding ten more stops (seven solo) and another pick in the postseason. In 2019, he played in all 15 games with 14 starts, posting 52 tackles (35 solo), the team-high four picks, tied for eighth in the National Football League, 13 passes defended, a forced fumble and two coverage stops. In 2020, he had a club-best-tying three interceptions and has two picks in 2021, while ranking third with 38 tackles.

DB P.J. Williams, Florida State (D3b-15) - Williams' career was initially limited by missing all but two games his first two seasons with a hamstring injury (2015) and a concussion (2016), but he's rebounded to miss only two games with injury since. An experienced starter from Florida State, who developed into one of the nation's top cover corners, in 2019, he made 41 stops, a sack, an interception, three passes defended and one special teams stop, serving as the team's nickel corner for the second straight season. In the Dec. 22, 2019 win at Tennessee, Williams further showed his versatility by making the switch to safety after Marcus Williams was forced to depart with a groin injury and then starting in Williams' place in the regular season finale at Carolina. In 2020, Williams posted 37 tackles, a club-best two defensive fumble recoveries, one interception, two passes defended and three special teams stops in 15 games. Williams has a team-leading three picks, tied for fourth in the NFL in 2021 and has added seven tackles and four passes defense, playing in all seven games with one start. On Oct. 31 vs. Tampa Bay, Williams picked off Buccaneers QB Tom Brady for a 40-yard touchdown return. **CONTINUED ON NEXT PAGE**

STOPPING THE RUN

In rush defense, the Saints gave up only 80.2 net yards per game in 2018, second in the National Football League after giving up 129.4 per game in 2017. The 2019 Saints finished fourth in the NFL in opponent rushing yards per game (91.3). 2018-19 marked only the second time they did so in back-to-back seasons in franchise history, joining the 1986-1987 teams. The 2020 Saints were fourth in the NFL in opponent rushing yards per game and opponent rushing yards per carry.

The Saints produced their most impressive run-stopping effort in several seasons in 2018 and carried it over in 2019 and 2020. In seven straight games in 2018, they didn't surrender 100 rushing yards to an opponent for the first time since 2007 had a seven-game run in 2020. The Saints have not given up 100 yards rushing in their last four regular season contests. Below are the longest streaks in team history the defense has gone without surrendering 100 yards. Between 2017-20 they didn't allow a 100-yard rusher in a 55 straight games (regular season and postseason), the longest streak in NFL history. In holding Buccaneers TB Ronald Jones to nine yards on Nov. 8, New Orleans' efforts produced dominant results as his rushing total was the lowest for a leading rusher in a contest for an opponent during this streak. In Keeping San Francisco RB Jerrick McKinnon to 18 carries for 33 yards (1.8 avg.), New Orleans set the NFL record for the longest streak of keeping individual rushers under 100.

Blake Gillikin was signed by New Orleans following the 2020 NFL Draft after a college career at Penn State, where he finished tied for second on the Nittany Lions' career gross punting average charts (43.03). After spending his rookie season on Injured Reserve, Gillikin is ranked fifth in the NFL in net punting average in 2021 (43.4) after a breakout performance in Week 5, where he had three punts drop inside-the-three-yard line at the Washington

Football Team, flipping the field position battle and becoming the first punter since at least 2000 to have three punts of 53-plus yards downed inside the three-yard line. In Sunday's win over Tampa Bay, Gillikin punted at a 48.0 net clip and had a career-best 63-yard punt, helping him earn October's NFC Special Teams Player of the Month.

One of the club's two third round draft picks in 2020, Baun, a former University of Wisconsin standout, embraced work on the club's coverage units in 2020 with three stops. On Sept. 19 at Carolina, he made an adept play by returning a blocked field goal and ranked third on the team with four-stops after recording three stops in the last three games.

After spending the bulk of the 2019 and 2020 season on the Saints practice squad, Dowell recorded his first career blocked punt on September 26 at New England.

On October 25 at Seattle, Johnson filled in for some of the injured Taysom Hill's responsibilities on special teams and recorded his first career stop on coverage units in addition to contributing on offense.

A seventh round draft pick of New Orleans in 2019, Elliss' blue collar mentality fit in with the coverage units with four stops in 2020 and posted his first of 2021 on Sept. 19 at Carolina.

Signed as an undrafted free agent in 2019 out of Wyoming, the height of the 6-5 Granderson, helps in leverage in block units, shown when he blocked a 55-yard field goal attempt on Sept. 19 at Carolina. He recorded a stop in Monday night's win at Seattle.

Gray led the team in 2019 with 17 stops, blocked a punt and recovered a fumble on a muffed punt as he was selected an *AP* second-team All-Pro. Gray, voted by his teammates as the Saints special teams captain, led the team with two stops in the season opener and is tied for the team lead with six stops in 2021, a team-best six solo.

Heath is a nine-year NFL veteran who signed with New Orleans during training camp after spending the first seven seasons of his NFL career in Dallas and 2020 in Las Vegas, posting 63 career coverage stops, including three in 2021.

Montgomery, a seven-year National Football League veteran, was originally a third round pick of the Packers in 2015 out of Stanford. He can play tailback and wideout and also possesses the ability to return kicks. In the season opener against Green Bay, Montgomery downed a punt at the Packers five-yard line and had his first career special teams stop. On Sept. 19 at Carolina, he followed it up with three coverage stops and is tied for the team lead with six stops with Gray.

Washington is a sixth-year NFL veteran who was originally a seventh round draft pick of the Detroit Lions in 2016. In addition to his value in providing dependable depth at the tailback, Washington has excelled on special teams for New Orleans. In his career, he has posted 11 coverage stops and one blocked punt recovery.

Williams, in his seventh season, has continued to add to his versatility the past two seasons, flipping between cornerback and free safety on multiple occasions as well as increasing his contributions to the coverage units, where he posted four regular season stops in 2020 and his first post-season coverage tackle in the NFC wild card playoff win over Chicago.

Harris has made an impact on New Orleans' return game since being picked up as an undrafted free agent in 2019. Harris was signed following the NFL Draft out of NCAA Division II Assumption, where he finished his college career as one of the most prolific returners in NCAA history. In the final game of his college career, he set the NCAA-All Division record for career combined return touchdowns (14).

In 2019, Harris brought back 36 punts for 338 yards (9.4 avg.), ranked first in the NFC and fourth in the National Football League in punt return average, ranked second among rookies, following a 53-yard runback for a touchdown in the first quarter of the Sept. 22 33-27 win at Seattle.

He also returned 24 kickoffs for 644 yards (26.8 avg.), second in the NFC and third in the NFL and has recorded one special teams stop. On offense Harris carried twice for 18 yards (9.0 avg.) and caught six passes for 24 yards.

Harris is the first player signed by New Orleans as an undrafted rookie following the draft to be selected to the Pro Bowl as a rookie.

In 2020, despite playing in only nine games due to injuries, Harris showed his abilities to make big plays, averaging 9.3 yards per punt return, 27.3 yards per kickoff return and catching 20 passes for 186 yards and one touchdown. He returned to the active roster from Injured Reserve for the wild card win over Chicago and led the team in receiving with seven receptions for 83 yards. The following week in the NFC Divisional Playoff vs. Tampa Bay, Harris returned a punt 54 yards.

In the September 12 season opener vs. Green Bay, in addition to handling return duties, Harris had two grabs for 72 yards, including catching a 55-yard bomb for a touchdown from Jameis Winston. On Sept. 19 at Carolina, Harris injected life into New Orleans' field position, returning five kickoffs for a career-high 156 yards (31.2 avg.) with a 39-yard runback. QUARTERBACKS

TAYSOM HILL

Hill's brought unheralded versatility to the Saints offense and special teams. A constant participant on special teams from midseason in 2017 to midseason in 2020, as well as the backup signal-caller and as a runner and receiver, in 2018, Hill averaged 24.9 yards per return on 14 kickoff returns, had six coverage stops, second on the team, completed a ten-yard pass on a fake punt and blocked a punt. Overall, Hill carried 37 times for 196 yards (5.3 avg.), third on the team, with two touchdowns and completed three of seven passes for 64 yards. The blocked punt that sparked a division-clinching win at Tampa Bay, earning him Week 14 NFC Special Teams Player of the Week. In the postseason, he caught a touchdown, made a special teams tackle and executed a successful fake punt, making significant contributions in all facets as the team advanced to the NFC Championship game for the third time in franchise history.

In 2019, Hill carried 27 times for 156 yards (5.8 avg.) with a touchdown, catching 19 passes for 234 yards with six TDs, deflecting a punt and posting two coverage stops. He ranked third on the club in touchdowns and third in receiving TDs. After a multi-threat performance Thanksgiving night at Atlanta, when he deflected a punt and caught and rushed for a touchdown. Hill became the first quarterback to rush for and catch a touchdown in the same contest since Jim McMahon (1983). In a valiant postseason effort vs. Minnesota, Hill led the team in rushing with four carries for 50 yards, caught two passes for 25 yards with a TD and completed a 50-yard pass.

In 2020, Hill contributed on multiple facets, completing 88-of-121 passes (72.7%) for 928 yards with a 98.8 rating, rushing 87 times for 457 (5.3 avg.) yards with eight touchdowns, catching eight passes for 98 yards with a TD and playing on special teams units until Brees' rib injury. Following Brees' injury, November 15, Hill went 3-1 in four starts.

In the 2021 season-opening win, Hill contributed to a 38-3 victory over Green Bay, completing a pass for three yards, rushing twice, including gaining a first down once and playing on special teams. Sept. 19 at Carolina, Hill started at tight end and rushed twice for 16 yards and added one coverage stop. In the September 26 win at New England, Hill carried six times for 32 yards, while his fourth quarter four-yard touchdown run helped seal the win. Oct. 3 vs. the New York Giants, Hill scored two rushing touchdowns for the third time in his career. Overall, he's completed five of six passes for 45 yards, carried 17 times for 81 yards (4.8 avg.) with a club-best three touchdowns, caught three passes for 37 yards and also added one special teams stop.

A DAY FOR FIRSTS

In Brees' absence in 2020, Hill received his first career start on November 22, 2020 vs. Atlanta and completed 18-of-23 passes for 233 yards, while carrying ten times for 51 yard with two touchdowns and a 108.9 passer rating in leading New Orleans to a 24-9 win over the Falcons.

Hill joined Daunte Culpepper as he second player in the Super Bowl era with 40+ rushing yards and 2+ rushing TDs in his first QB start. He became the first Saints signal-caller to rush for 50+ yards and 2+ TDs, since Archie Manning carried seven times for 52 yards and two scores in a 24-14 win over Dallas at Tulane stadium on Oct. 17, 1971.

VERSATILE VICTOR

Hill followed Head Coach Sean Payton and his coaching staff's game plan in a 31-3 victory over Denver on Nov. 29, 2020 that called for more of a ground-based effort. Completing nine of 16 passes, he also was a key part of a ground game that gained a season-high 229 yards, carrying ten times for 44 yards with two touchdowns of his own on the ground for the second consecutive week himself.

In the December 6, 2021, 21-16 win at Atlanta to punch New Orleans' playoff ticket for the fourth straight season, Hill was a threat both with his arm and legs, completing 27-of-37 passes for 232 yards, his first two career touchdown passes and a 107.0 passer rating. In the run game, Hill carried 15 times for a career-high 83 yards (5.9 avg.), including a career-long 43-yard rush. Hill became the first Saints signal-caller to win his first three career starts at the position, joining Brees as the second Saint to win his first three starts in Black and Gold.

ON THE RUN

Hill enjoyed the most prolific rushing season for a Saints signal-caller in 2020, helping them maintain high seeding status in the NFC postseason race in Brees' absence with his arm, legs and leadership. Hill's 457 rushing yards ranked first all-time in club record books for Saints quarterbacks in a single season, while his rushing touchdown total is first. Hill finished the fifth among NFL signal-callers in rushing yardage, tied for third in rushing touchdowns.

TREVOR SIEMIAN

- Siemian brings addition starting experience to the Saints quarterback room. Originally a seventh round draft pick in the 2015 NFL Draft by the Denver Broncos out of Northwester, Siemian has played in 29 career games with 26 starts, completing 539-of-911 passes for 6,097 yards with 33 touchdowns and 24 interceptions.
- On October 31 vs. Tampa Bay, Siemian entered the game in relief of an injured Jameis Winston and helped lead the Saints to victory, completing 16-of-29 passes 159 yards and a one-yard scoring throw to FB Alex Armah.
- On Sunday vs. Atlanta, Siemian received his first start as a Saint and completed 25-of-41 passes for 249 yards with two touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 94.5 passer rating. In the fourth quarter, Siemian helped lead the offense to score 19 points and take a brief 25-24 lead, completing 12-of-17 passes (70.6 %) for 110 yards with two touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 127.1 passer rating.

IAN BOOK

- Book was the team's fourth round pick out of Notre Dame, where he was the Fighting Irish's winningest quarterback of all time (30 victories). In four seasons in South Bend, Book played in 45 games and completed 728-of-1,141 attempts for 8,949 yards, 72 touchdowns and 20 interceptions, while carrying 360 times for 1,518 yards and 17 TDs.

RUNNING BACKS

ALVIN KAMARA

- A talented runner and receiver with a 5-10, 215-pound frame who was selected by the Saints in the third round of the 2017 NFL Draft out of Tennessee, Kamara enjoyed an outstanding rookie campaign. He ranked first on the club and sixth in the NFL in total yards from scrimmage (1,554), second on the team in rushing and receiving, carrying 120 times for 728 yards (6.1 avg.) with eight TDs and a two-point conversion, catching 81 passes for 826 yards (10.2

avg.) with five TDs and a kickoff return for a TD for a club rookie record 14 total scores, tied for second in the NFL. Kamara finished first in the National Football League in yards per carry.

- Kamara was the first Saints offensive rookie selected to the Pro Bowl since Rueben Mayes (1986), as an *Associated Press* second team All-Pro (flex), the clubs' first rookie All-Pro since 1993. He was named *The Sporting News* NFL Rookie of the Year and *AP* NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year.

- Since entering the NFL in 2017, Kamara ranks third in the NFL in total yards from scrimmage (6,900) behind Ezekiel Elliott (7,046) and Derrick Henry (7,016).

- After signing a long-term contract extension on the eve of the 2020 regular season, Kamara even exceeded expectations as one of the most electric players in the National Football League. He carried 187 times for a career-high 932 yards (5.0 avg.) with 16 touchdowns, tied for first in the NFL. He led all running backs in receiving with a career-high and team best 83 receptions for 756 yards (9.1 avg.) with five touchdowns. Kamara, who was the second Saint to lead the team in both rushing and receiving, currently led the NFL with a franchise-record 21 total touchdowns, was second with 93 first downs and third with a career-best 1,688 total yards from scrimmage, the seventh-highest total in club history.

- Kamara enjoyed a productive start to the season in the season-opening win over Green Bay, when he started and finished with 83 rushing yards on 20 attempts. He now stands at 3,423 career rushing yards, surpassing Chuck Muncie and Rueben Mayes for sixth place in the Saints' record books. Kamara added eight receiving yards on three receptions, with one receiving touchdown, surpassing Pierre Thomas for the seventh-most receptions in club record books and the most receptions all-time for a Saints running back.

MARK INGRAM II

• One of the club's two first round draft picks in 2011, the 2009 Heisman Trophy winner has an integral part of the rushing attack since his arrival in New Orleans as the 28th overall pick. In 11 NFL seasons, Ingram has played in 141 games with 95 starts, carrying 1,702 times for 7,688 yards (4.5 avg.) with 63 touchdowns, also catching 274 passes for 1,965 yards with ten touchdowns for 9,653 total yards from scrimmage. For his Saints career in which he has played in 108 games with 64 starts, he ranks second in club record books with 6,077 yards rushing, first with 50 rushing touchdowns and tied for third with 55 total touchdowns. Acquired by New Orleans from the Houston Texans on Oct. 29 after spending the 2019 and 2020 seasons in Baltimore, Ingram has 107 carries for 364 yards with one touchdown and 14 receptions for 60 yards in nine games with eight starts split between the Saints and the Texans in 2021.

WIDE RECEIVERS

MARQUEZ CALLAWAY

•After a productive college career on offense and special teams at Tennessee, Callaway joined the Black and Gold as an undrafted free agent in 2020. Appearing in 11 games with three starts, Callaway posted 21 receptions for 213 yards and also made an impact as a gunner and punt returner. He returned 11 punts for 122 yards (11.1 avg.), four kickoff returns for 94 yards (23.5 avg.) and recovered two punts on special teams. In 2021, Callaway looks to build off an impressive all-around rookie campaign.

Q FACTOR

In the September 26 win at New England, Callaway had four reception for 48 yards and scored his first career NFL touchdown from Jameis Winston.

The Tennessee product product then made a couple of big catches on October 3 vs. the New York Giants, catching two receptions for 74 yards, including a 58-yard grab in the second half.

In the Week Five win at the Washington Football Team, Callaway posted four receptions for 85 yards with a career-high two touchdowns, including a perfectly anticipated 49-yard "Hail Mary" scoring reception from Winston at the end of the first half.

Although Callaway had only three receptions for 32 yards in Monday night's win at Seattle, he saved his best for last with a fourth quarter 13-yard reception that advanced New Orleans to the Seahawks six-yard line and set up a 33-yard field goal.

As the only Saints wideout to play in all eight games, Callaway leads the Saints wide receiver corps in receiving with 22 receptions for 309 yards and is tied with Kamara for first on the club with four receiving touchdowns after his fourth quarter five-yard scoring catch in the fourth quarter of Sunday's hard-fought comeback loss to Atlanta.

TRE'QUAN SMITH

• A talented fourth-year wideout, who was selected by New Orleans in the third round of the 2018 draft out of Central Florida, the 6-1, 210-pounder emerged as one of the Knights' top weapons from 2015-17 and was a key figure in their emergence. During that period, he caught 168 passes for 2,748 yards (16.4 avg.) with 22 touchdowns. In his final campaign for the 13-0 Knights in 2017, Smith appeared in and started all 13 games and hauled in 54 receptions for 1,082 yards (19.9 avg.) and 13 touchdowns.

• Smith recorded five touchdowns apiece in each of his first two seasons and achieved more consistency in 2020, when he posted a career-high 34 receptions for 448 yards (13.2. avg.) with four TDs to rank fourth on the Black and Gold in receiving. He was activated off Injured Reserve for the NFC Divisional Playoff vs. Tampa Bay, where he recorded three receptions for 85 yards (28.3 avg.) with scoring grabs from Drew Brees and Jameis Winston.

• Activated off Injured Reserve on October 25, Smith scored his first touchdown in his second appearance of the season on a 16-yard scoring grab from Jameis Winston in the first quarter of the October 31 win over Tampa Bay. Overall, he has seven grabs for 97 yards.

TIGHT ENDS**ADAM TRAUTMAN**

• The Saints were pleased to find the 6-5, 253-pound Trautman available near the end of the third round of the 2020 NFL Draft and made an aggressive trade up to the 105th pick to add him out of the University of Dayton. A converted high school quarterback, the Michigan native moved to tight end as a freshman developed into one of the top offensive player in NCAA FCS football, where he played in 44 games, recording 178 receptions for 2,295 yards (12.9 avg.) and 31 touchdowns. Though 16 regular season contests, Trautman posted 15 receptions for 171 yards with one touchdown while also impressively developing his blocking ability. In his 2021 debut against Green Bay, Trautman caught three balls for 18 yards. In the Week Five win at the Washington Football Team, he added two grabs for 43 yards, including a fourth quarter 32-yard grab. For the season, he leads the tight ends group with 15 catches for 151 yards.

DEFENSIVE LINE**CAMERON JORDAN**

• New Orleans' first choice in the 2011 NFL Draft (24th overall) out of the University of California, Jordan enjoyed another standout season in 2019, posting 53 tackles (37 solo) with a career-high 15.5 sacks, to rank third in the NFL in takedowns, three passes defended and one fumble recovery. as he was selected to his fifth Pro Bowl and a second-team AP All-Pro selection. With 96.5 sacks in ten seasons, Jordan's second on the Saints career sack list. He's also proven to be one of the NFL's best run defenders, playing an important role in top five rush defenses in each of the past three seasons.

CARL GRANDERSON

•Signed by New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Wyoming in 2019, Granderson posted 17.5 career sacks in college and possesses the perfect body type for a pass rusher. As a rookie, Granderson appeared in eight regular season contests, posting ten tackles and one sack. In 2020, Granderson added 11 tackles, five sacks, ranked fourth on the team, a club-best two forced fumbles and one pass defended as he has seen more extensive time in the club's defensive line rotation as his game experience has continued to increase. On September 19 at Carolina, Granderson received his first start in place of an injured Marcus Davenport and blocked his first career field goal on special teams. In Week Five at the Washington Football Team, Granderson recorded his first takedown of 2021.

MALCOLM ROACH

•Signed as an undrafted free agent out of Texas in 2020, the Baton Rouge native has played in all four games with two starts in 2021, posting five tackles (two solo), one interception and one pass defense, helping hold down the interior for the NFL's second-ranked rush defense.

TANO KPASSAGNON

• Kpassagnon joined the Saints via unrestricted free agency in the offseason, looking to bring his size, speed and athleticism to one of the most productive lines in the NFL. Formerly a second round draft choice in the 2017 NFL Draft (59th overall) out of Villanova by Kansas City, Kpassagnon spent his first four seasons developing into a pass rushing presence along the Chiefs front. He started 15-of-16 games for Kansas City in 2020, recording 28 tackles (20 solo), a sack and three passes defended, starting all three postseason contests with five tackles (one solo), one sack and one pass defense in the Chiefs' run to Super Bowl LV. For his career, the fifth-year pro's played in 67 regular season games with 29 starts, recording 90 tackles (67 solo), 11 sacks, seven passes defended, a fumble recovery, two forced fumbles, a special teams stop and a blocked field goal. Kpassagnon has also started six-of-eight postseason contests for Kansas City, posting 12 tackles (nine solo), three sacks and two passes defended.

• In his Saints debut on September 12, Kpassagnon's sack/forced fumble recovered by Kaden Elliss at the New Orleans two-yard line in the fourth quarter against Green Bay, would keep the Packers out of the end zone for the season-opening win. He added a second sack in the team's win at New England, Sept. 26 to take the team lead for takedowns. Following a sack in the October 25 win at Seattle and he leads the team with four takedowns.

DAVID ONYEMATA

• A fourth round selection out of Manitoba in 2016, Onyemata teams with Shy Tuttle to form a solid duo in the interior of the Saints defensive line. In 79 games with 41 starts in five seasons, he has posted 184 career tackles, 16 sacks, five passes defended, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery. In 2019, he opened all 15 regular season games he played in, posting 32 stops, one pass defended and three sacks for the NFL's fourth-ranked run defense. Onyemata was re-signed to a three-year contract by the Saints in the 2020 offseason and is ranked third on the team with 6.5 quarterback takedowns, tied for sixth in the league among defensive tackles and one interception, starting every contest for a unit ranked fourth in the NFL in opponent net yards per game and fourth in run defense. In 2021, he anchors an interior that has helped the Saints defense currently be ranked first in the league in both run categories.

LINEBACKERS**DEMARIO DAVIS**

• This dependable and sure-tackling defender joined the Saints after a breakout 2017, where he started 16 games for the Jets. Davis posted a team-high and career-high 165 tackles (112 solo) and a career-best five sacks. For his career, the Brandon, Miss. native has appeared in 152 games with 138 starts for the Jets (2012-15, 2017), Cleveland (2016) and Saints, recording 1,059 tackles (702 solo), 29.5 sacks, two interceptions, 41 passes defended, three forced fumbles, six fumble recoveries and 24 special team stops.

• In 2018, Davis opened all 16 contests and led the team with 110 stops (74 solo), five sacks to lead the linebackers, four passes defended, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. Davis' abilities to diagnose and tackle played a key role in New Orleans ranking second in the NFL in opponent rushing yards per game and opponent rushing yards per play. Participating in the postseason for the first time, Davis led the defense with 22 stops (15 solo), an interception in the NFC Championship and a pass defense. In 2019, he posted 111 stops, ranked first on the club, four sacks, one interception and 11 passes defended to help spur the league's fourth-ranked run defense.

ZACK BAUN

• An athletic, sideline to sideline linebacker, possessing the rare combination of pass rush skills and the ability to drop in coverage. After a stellar college career at Wisconsin, Baun played in 15 regular season games in 2020, with three starts at strongside linebacker, posting eight tackles (three solo) and four special teams stops. Overall in his college career, he played in 39 games with 27 starts, all which took place in his final two seasons, recording 154 tackles, 30.5 stops for loss, 15 sacks, two interceptions and three forced fumbles.

• Baun took advantage of a conventional training camp and preseason to gain strength and knowledge of the defense,

which was on display when he led the team with five solo tackles in the season opening win vs. Green Bay.

KADEN ELLISS

• Kaden Elliss was selected by the Saints with their second of two seventh round draft choices (244th overall) in 2019 out of Idaho. Elliss is a strong, athletic player with coverage, pass rush and run-stopping abilities who bounced back after missing the majority of 2019 (knee). In 2020, he appeared in 15 regular season games and two postseason contests on special teams recording five stops. The son of former NFL standout Luther Elliss, he will look to play a bigger role in 2021 utilizing his strength, speed and size. In the opening win over Green Bay, Elliss's adept recovery in the fourth quarter at the New Orleans two-yard line would keep the Packers out of the end zone for the contest.

PETE WERNER

New Orleans selected this three-year starter from Ohio State to compete at the linebacker position in the second round of the 2021 NFL Draft. The Indianapolis, Ind. native finished his college career playing in 47 career games with 35 starts, recording 185 tackles (111 solo), 16 stops for loss, four sacks, 11 passes defended, four forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Werner helped power the Buckeyes to the College Football Playoff championship game as a senior in 2020, when he was voted by Big Ten coaches as a first-team All-Conference selection and a Butkus Award semifinalist, posting 54 tackles, 2.5 stops for loss, one sack and two forced fumbles. Werner made his second career start October 3 vs. the Giants and recorded a career-high ten tackles. With 13 stops in the Week Five win at Washington, the Indianapolis native became the first Saints rookie defender to reach double-digit totals in back-to-back games. He's fourth on the team with 37 stops and also picked up his first career coverage tackle Sunday vs. Atlanta.

SECONDARY

MARSHON LATTIMORE

• Selected by the New Orleans Saints in the first round (11th overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft, Lattimore started all 13 games he appeared in. He totaled 53 tackles (44 solo), a forced fumble, one fumble recovery, five interceptions for 85 yards and 18 passes defended, as he became the youngest Saint (21 years old) ever selected to the Pro Bowl and was selected as the AP NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year.

• In 2018, Lattimore opened all 16 contests and posted a career-high 59 tackles (49 solo), two interceptions, 12 passes defended, a club-best four forced fumbles, tied for fourth in the NFL and three fumble recoveries, returned for 91 yards, leading the team in takeaways and tied for the NFL lead in defensive fumble recoveries, the highest total among defensive backs. Lattimore also added two picks in the NFC Divisional Playoff win over Philadelphia.

• A standout 2019 campaign by Lattimore resulted in him being voted to the Pro Bowl, the only Saints cornerback to ever be selected multiple times. Lattimore started all 14 games he played in and posted 57 stops, one interception and ranked first on the team with 14 passes defended.

• In 2020, he posted a career-high 62 tackles (52 solo), two interceptions and 11 passes defended as he was voted to the Pro Bowl for the third time. High expectations follow in 2021 as he signed a long-term contract extension to lock up the lockdown corner in the New Orleans secondary.

• After signing a contract extension at the start of the season, Lattimore's posted 27 stops, one pick and ten passes defended.

OUT OF THE MARSH

• In the September 26 28-13 win at New England, Lattimore picked off Patriots QB Mac Jones in the game's next to last play to seal the victory.

MARCUS WILLIAMS

• After being selected in the second round of the 2017 NFL Draft (42nd overall) out of the Utah, this ball-hawking safety has started all 65 games he has appeared in, recording 258 tackles (193 solo), one sack, 15 interceptions, one returned for a touchdown, 33 passes defended, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. With a team-leading three interceptions in 2020, Williams' 15 picks since being drafted is tied for seventh in the NFL over that period, tied for third among safeties.

• Williams was a stalwart in the secondary for New Orleans in 2020, recording 59 tackles to ranked fourth on the team (40 solo), three interceptions and seven passes defended, to tied for the team lead in picks, while also recording a career-high nine stops, November 15, vs. San Francisco, topping it with a pick vs. Atlanta, November 22.

• Williams continued his trend of fast starts, recording an interception in a season opener for the third consecutive season, picking off Aaron Rodgers in the third quarter and returning the pick 53 yards to set up a New Orleans touchdown in the 38-3 win. Through the first eight contests of 2021, Williams has posted 37 tackles (26 solo), two picks, four passes defended and one forced fumble.

MALCOLM JENKINS

• Returning to New Orleans this offseason after six seasons in Philadelphia, Malcolm Jenkins is one of the National Football League's most intelligent and instinctive defensive backs. One of only two safeties in Saints history to be selected as an *Associated Press* All-Pro, Jenkins has played in 191 career games with 183 starts and has career totals of 1,254 tackles (890 solo), 13 sacks, 21 interceptions, with seven returned for touchdowns, 129 passes defended, 16 forced fumbles, nine fumble recoveries, one special teams fumble recovery, one blocked field goal and 44 special teams stops.

• In his 2020 Saints return, Jenkins finished ranked second on the team with 91 tackles (69 solo), filling up the stat sheet with two sacks, three interceptions to tie a career-high, ten passes defended, reaching double-digits in the category for the seventh consecutive season, one forced fumble and a fumble recovery, playing virtually every defensive snap, after being voted by his teammates as a team captain, Jenkins led the team with four takeaways on the season. Through the first eight contests of 2021, Jenkins has posted 49 tackles (32 solo), a 34-yard interception return for a touchdown from his strong safety position, four passes defended and a sack.

• Selected in the fourth round (109th overall) of the 2019 overall draft out of the University of Florida by New Orleans, Gardner-Johnson's hard-hitting and playmaking persona took root as a rookie in 2019, when he played in all 16 games with seven starts, posting 46 tackles (35 solo), one interception, eight passes defended, a forced fumble, a fumble recovery and three special teams stops. In 2020, he has established a niche as the club's starting nickel, playing in all 15 games with 13 starts and posting 65 tackles to rank third on the club, one sack, one interception and a club-best 13 passes defended for the NFL's fourth-ranked defense in opponent net yards per game, fourth against the run and fifth against the pass. In 2021, playing a hybrid role of both cornerback and safety, Williams leads the team with three picks for 86 yards returned including a game-clinching 40-yard interception return for a touchdown on October 31 vs. Tampa Bay. 2021 REVIEW: vs. **Green Bay (9/12):** Made his first start for the Saints and passed for 148 yards on 14-of-20 passing with a 130.8 quarterback rating. Winston threw 5 touchdown passes, with a long of 55 yards on a touchdown pass to Deonte Harris. His five touchdown

passes tied a career-high from when he threw five touchdowns against the Eagles (11/22/15) as a member of Tampa Bay. He also finished with 37 rushing yards on six attempts. Winston earned his first victory as the starting quarterback for the black and gold. In his first start with the Saints, Winston became the third player since 1950 to throw for five touchdowns in his first start with a team, finishing 14-of-20 for 148 yards and the five touchdowns. Winston's 148 passing yards is the fewest yards with five passing touchdowns since 1948. Winston got the Saints on the scoreboard with his first rushing touchdown of the season with 14:37 remaining in the fourth quarter. Winston eclipsed 20,000 career passing yards against the Panthers. **at New England (9/26):** Made his third start as a Saint, completing 13-of-21 passes for 128 yards and two scores. The win Sunday marks the 18th team Winston has defeated in his career as a starter. **vs. N.Y. Giants (10/3):** Winston completed 17-of-23 passes for 226 and one score on the afternoon, without having a chance to see the field in overtime. Winston's 58-yard completion to Marquez Callaway on the opening drive of the second half was his longest completion as a Saint, regular season or postseason. POSTGAME NOTES

- New Orleans' record falls to 5-3 with the loss on Sunday and have sole possession of second place in the NFC South.
- The Saints win regular season record against the Falcons falls to 51-53, their first loss to Atlanta since November 10, 2019.
- Head Coach Sean Payton's regular season record against Atlanta falls to 20-9. Payton's 20 victories against the Falcons remain the most by an NFL head coach against the Falcons.
- Payton's record in the month of November is now 38-19.
- The Saints extended their streak to 312 regular season games without having been shut out, dating back to a 26-20 win at the Tampa Bay Buccaneers on September 6, 2002 at Raymond James Stadium. This is the longest running streak for not being shutout in the National Football League.
- T **Terron Armstead** played in his 100th career game (regular season/postseason combined) as New Orleans gained 376 total net yards, the team's second-highest total of the season
- LB **Demario Davis** finished with six tackles (four solo) in Sunday's contest. Davis now has 399 tackles as a Saint in his fourth season with the Black and Gold, needing one more stop to reach 400 for his Saints career.
- After returning three punts for 50 yards (16.7 avg.) on Sunday, wide receiver/return specialist **Deonte Harris** has 654 career punt return yards, surpassing Rich Mauti to move into seventh in club record books. Harris led the team with a career-high six receptions with 52 yards, also bringing back two kickoffs for 51 yards (27.5 avg.).
- Quarterback **Trevor Siemian** went 25-of-41 passing for 249 yards with two scores and zero interceptions. Siemian became the 34th player to start a game at quarterback in Saints franchise history.
- Quarterback **Taysom Hill** went two-of-two passing for 33 yards and rushed one time for 4 yards. Hill now has 890 career rushing yards, third for a Saints signal-caller behind Archie Manning (2,058) and Aaron Brooks (1,410). Hill needs 110 rushing yards to become the third Saints signal-caller with 1,000 rushing yards as a Saint.
- Running back **Mark Ingram II** finished with nine rushes for 43 yards and caught five passes for 21 yards. Ingram now has 6,077 career rushing yards as a Saint. With 20 more rushing yards next Sunday at Tennessee, he would surpass Deuce McAllister for first place on the club's all-time rushing yardage list. Ingram is also tied with McAllister for third in club record books with 55 total touchdowns. Additionally, Ingram now only needs 96 total yards from scrimmage to surpass McAllister next Sunday to move into third all-time in franchise history. Ingram also played in his 108th career game as a Saint, moving into a tie for 38th place in club records with running back Dalton Hilliard and kicker John Carney.
- Safety **Malcolm Jenkins** had five tackles (one solo). Jenkins now has 1,254 career tackles, eclipsing the 1,250 mark for his career.
- DE **Cameron Jordan** finished with four tackles (one solo) and one sack. Jordan now has 97.5 career sacks and moves into a tie with Simon Fletcher, Jacob Green, Dexter Manley and Mario Williams for 39th in league history. Jordan needs one sack to move past Joey Porter (98) at 38th all-time.
- DE **Marcus Davenport** posted six tackles (three solo), one sack in the fourth quarter and one forced fumble.
- WR **Kevin White** had two special teams tackles (one solo) and also had a forced fumble on kickoff coverage.

- RB **Alvin Kamara** had 13 rushes for 50 yards and a score in Sunday's contest. Kamara now has 457 rushing yards against Atlanta, surpassing Tampa Bay as the team Kamara has the most rushing yards against. Kamara also caught four passes for 54 yards, totaling 104 yards from scrimmage.
- Wide receiver **Marquez Callaway** caught his fourth career touchdown pass Sunday, finishing with three catches for 25 yards.
- Wide receiver **Kenny Stills** had two catches for 30 yards with one touchdown, his first of the 2021 season. Stills now has 4,907 career receiving yards, needing 93 more yards to reach 5,000 for his career.

(Opening statement): "It is a tough way to lose a game. Tip your hat to Atlanta. I thought they played better than us today. You can focus more on the result of that game. As a coach, our jobs are to focus on what caused the result. We did not do enough things well today. That always bothers you as the coach because you're wanting to see your performance be more consistent, better, but there were too many penalties, too many long yardage situations. We put ourselves behind the eight-ball a number of times on offense in the first half. We finally put together a few drives at the end of the game. We did not do the things that winning teams do consistently in our league. We have to get that corrected. We have to do a better job coaching. That starts with me and being more consistent in some areas. Our third down numbers, now two-three weeks in a row, have been just average at best. We kind of go from there. It is what it is."

(On the speed of the game in the second half): "We sped up the tempo in the fourth quarter. There was a point in which we were down more than two scores. Quickly, we got into a two-minute mode. Fortunately, we were able to score. We kind of stayed with that the next drive. Once the time was in our favor, we kind of went back to a more traditional approach on the final drive when we scored. That happened on the third to last drive, fourth to last drive of the game."

(On the reason for the tempo adjustment): "You're looking at the scoreboard and saying you can't just meander along here and run handoffs and huddle up. We need to get moving a little bit."

(On if the Saints would have let the Falcons score on the last drive): "Yeah. Typically, you take a knee there. They took a knee on the next play. We got it punched out. I do not know who did it. It is hard to see. When it's that close, you've seen us in that position before -- run the clock down, kick the field goal with no time left. [Mike Davis] was smart enough where he was going to not score."

(On Trevor Siemian's performance): "Overall, he played well. We missed some pickups. He had a few throws in there that were not primary receivers and played with poise, brought us back. I thought, overall, I felt like it was good. Of course, we will look at it and grade it. I thought we dropped a few balls, more than our fair share. Like I said, we were third-and-long, I don't know how many times with the penalties in the first half, frustrating."

(On if the Saints could have done anything different in coverage on the last big play): "Yes, you want to stay on top of your coverage in that situation. We were playing in a three-deep zone."

(On using Taysom Hill today and his contributions): "We had a package (for him). I thought he gave us some energy when he came in. We had a run; we had a handful of plays. It was just kind of how the game went. Look, if you're not converting third downs, then your number count is not going to be 70-something offensive plays or 80. You are going to have a shorter amount of plays. He is part of the plan."

(On the sequence with Hill): "I think it was the second half. There was a sequence of plays. We were getting a lot of single-safety, man-to-man looks. We got to one of his runs earlier. Then, we got to some play-action passes. A lot of it was by design."

(On if there was a thought of changing the quarterback) "It wasn't changing the quarterback. That's a fair question. It was more of trying to get to a play that we had that he was taking the snaps of."

(On C.J. Gardner-Johnson's injury): "He's a good football player. It's always difficult when you lose a starter like that. We had to make some adjustments. Hopefully, he can get back on the field quicker than later. It's tough. No update. We will keep you guys posted."

(On if the Saints had to get out of their game plan): "No, well the time you would say you were out of your game plan a little bit is when we were in that hurry-up offense. The minute we got into no huddle, you kind of got out of your game plan there. You're having to react according to the score on the game and the time left on the clock. The next series, we were still in hurry up and scored. That final series, we were back in our game plan. The time was in our favor."

(On Alvin Kamara's run on the failed two-point conversion): "It's hard to tell. We have to see the film. It was a running play. It happened so quickly. We'll watch, make corrections on it and see what happened."

(On if it is fair to say that the Saints did not do enough to affect Matt Ryan today) "Yeah, I think that is fair to say. I don't know what his numbers were, but they were pretty good. Yeah, I think it is fair to say that"

(On the dropped passes): "It wasn't just receivers, I saw other guys dropping balls."

On if winning close games like this today's one is becoming the team's identity: "We hope so. That is what we said when Mr. (Arthur) Blank hired me and Terry (Fontenot). We wanted a tough-minded football team. It's hard to build that. You get in games like this, yeah, sure, you would love to be in four-minute and win easy in the fourth quarter. It's a really good football team (that we beat). They are 5-2, and this is a really tough place to play. It's a divisional rival. I mean, just write all of the narratives that you can. Our guys don't flinch. I was joking with Mr. Blank that I'll get a text later from my mother telling me to stop doing that. We're just trying to win. So, we'll do it any way we can. And, when you put the ball in Matt Ryan's hand with the game on the line, my money is on Matt. That's how I feel."

On where the game became close in the fourth quarter: "It's the National Football League. It's not for soft souls. If you get comfortable, shame on you."

On Cordarrelle Patterson's 64-yard reception to set up the winning field goal: "He is a really good football player. Obviously, we had a lot of faith in CP, and Matt (Ryan), and the o-line... The drive before, we tried to stay aggressive. Credit to the Saints, they made plays. We weren't going to get into a three yard and a cloud of dust (game), so we tried a couple of different things. We got the penalty on the first down on the drive before. Then, we went into little zone reads to see if we'd get them some yards going, and they played it pretty well. It shows the faith we have in Feleipe (Franks), because those are big time situations right there, but I trusted Feleipe with the football. He was smart. I know it wasn't what we wanted; and, they jammed us up on the next one. You play fast. It feels ugly. Then, we get sacked. Dustin Colquitt kicks it (and) they (the Saints) come down and make a play. That's the NFL. Our guys just kept swinging. Trevor (Siemian) makes one out to the left. They scored and go ahead. I looked up and there was plenty of time. We had our two timeouts. I said, "We are good." We stopped them. Those two point conversions, they went for it on both of those. That is when you get into the game, the unintended consequences. They missed one and were forced to go for it again, and we stopped them both. Those were two huge plays in this game."

(More on the Patterson reception) "When you get an explosive play to start a drive like that, it certainly makes it easier to play call it. When you go in there and it's incomplete or something negative happens, that building gets ramped up. It was an enormous play."

(On if he saw something that would make that play work at that time): "Yeah, just kind of how they had been playing on third down and two minute. It's a chess match. This is a really good defense and defensive staff. They made their adjustments and we made ours. We put it out there and we got the matchup that we wanted. CP made it work."

(On what he told Matt Ryan before the last drive of the game) "We have a neutral mindset. We go in there, we talk about it, and say, "Hey, look, if we get this matchup over here, let's take it." That's what it boils down to. If they didn't give us that, we go on to something else. That is pretty simple. He is as cool as they can be. I don't know what this is (on how many comebacks he has in his career), but his comebacks are getting up there. It helps when you have a veteran, Hall of Fame-type quarterback."

On if there is something you can see in Ryan that says he can be that type of player) "Just look at his whole career, body of work, my experience with him, and already what has been done this season."

On his first experience as a head coach in this rivalry: "It's an intense rivalry. These guys (Saints) have been the standard in this division the last four years. I know that Tampa won the Super Bowl last year. It's a really tough division. Since Sean Payton has been here, they have had a lot of sustained success. So, it's a good win for us."

QB Trevor Siemian

On if it was hard to get in a rhythm after self-inflicted wounds: “Yeah, it just felt like we were one play away numerous of times. Unfortunately, we didn’t get it done, especially early. Seemed like every time we got something going, something came up the other way. So, we have to get that fixed.”

On if the drops are frustrating: “Not really. You are worrying about the next play, and I told the guys I’m going to keep coming at them. Unfortunately, in the first half we just have to be better.”

On what changed offensively and allowed the Saints to get rolling later on: “The urgency picked up quickly. For whatever reason we got it going but too little, too late. Can’t spot a team that many scores and expect to win.”

On how he felt for his first start in a long time: “I felt okay. There’s certainly some plays I want back; it wasn’t perfect. Just anxious to get into the game. You have first drive, second drive, and you feel like you are in a football game again. Just wish we could have done a little more in the first half, but it felt good.”

On if it is a battle to remain levelheaded and not get frustrated: “Yeah I think so. It’s frustrating for all of us. You’re worried about the next play, and we’ve got to get it fixed. The urgency certainly rises, but you do what it takes to get it right. Worrying doesn’t really help the cause so just focus on the next play and getting it right. We’ve got good players, so guys are going to make plays and we just have to give them opportunities.”

On what happened on the strip sack in the second quarter: “I told Terron (Armstead) I thought I was probably too deep. I have to look at it, but I thought I could have stepped up.”

On what his perspective is on this team: “We’ve got a really good team. We must take it one week at a time, but I don’t think there is anything we can’t do. Everyone in the locker room realizes that but the things that we didn’t do well today we have to get fixed. Next week is coming and I’m anxious to get back out and play. I wish it was tomorrow or the next day, but we’ve got to get it fixed and I think we will get it right.”

On if the battle of inconsistency is something they have to focus on: “Sure, but that’s the name of the game. If you’re consistent and did everything right all the time you’d be 17-0. That’s how this league works. You have to expect everyone’s best every game. We have to be ready to go next week.”

On if success in the 4th give him a better feeling about the day: “No, we lost.”

On what the whiplash is like being up late in the 4th and to lose in the final seconds: “I knew there was a lot of time left and the game wasn’t over when we scored at the end. Looked like (Cordarrelle) Patterson made a really good play on the sideline and it was a good throw. There was a lot of time left, so you’re still holding your breathe a little bit.”

On if he could feel momentum shift in the Saints favor as they got it going late in the game: “There was some drives we stayed on the field and we got a couple big plays. We got the momentum back and that was big. For us, you just have to find a way to capture that earlier in the game. You don’t have to be in 2-minute to do that either. I think we will get it right next week.”

SS MALCOLM JENKINS

On CJ Gardner-Johnson's injury: "He is obviously a huge part of what we do on our defense. He made a bunch of plays early in the game, a great matchup in the slot, pressures well. He does everything, so missing him is going to be a big deal. But I thought the guys, we put them everywhere and I thought they played well. Bradley Roby and (Paulson) Adebo out there, playing some (different) roles as well. It just calls for guys to be up, but I think we played well. Even though we lost, we feel good."

On his read on the Saints team right now: "All things considered, we've had an interesting first half of the season. I think we've competed well, I think we've shown ourselves that when we execute, we can play with anybody. The biggest thing for us that I would say we don't like is the inconsistency. We're a team that doesn't make excuses, we don't care about what's going on outside of who's on the field. For us, if we want to be the team that we want, we have to figure out how to continually be consistent, even, obviously, there are going to be some adverse situations. That is not uncommon. We have to come out more on the winning end of it than losing."

On concern of letting the guard down after a big, emotional win over Tampa: "I think it's easy to point to that. We had the Super Bowl MVP here last week coming off of a game in Seattle, that it's one of those games that we let our guard down. I really don't think that's the case. I think realistically as a team, our margin for error if we want to succeed is going to be smaller. We tried to put ourselves in that position, and we just didn't come out with it."

LT TERRON ARMSTEAD

On issues of keeping the Falcons contained today: "It was self-inflicted wounds and penalties. Some mishaps and mis-execution. I think we did a good job of converting some first downs, but the big third downs we just couldn't stay on the field and sustain drives, especially in the red zone. Penalties pushed us out, so mostly self-inflicted wounds."

On importance of executing a clean game with a new quarterback: "I mean, any game, every game, every week. This is the NFL. It's a small margin for error, and we keep committing those errors and putting ourselves in a bad starting spot. I think we responded well, cleaned up some areas, started to put some points on the board, but ultimately we just came up short."

On Trevor Siemian as starting QB running tempo offense: "Trevor Siemian is great, very composed, in control of everything. In the pocket he was great, good decisions, everything. I'm a huge fan."

On the team having a small margin for error with some of the injuries: "We don't want to make those mistakes, regardless of it we have (Jameis Winston) and the others, we don't want to make those mistakes. Especially the self-inflicted ones. You come into a game and things happen, but those guys make plays as well. The things we can control, we try to get that squared away during the week so when we come out on Sunday, we don't have those mistakes. I would say this team has a different margin of error from others, and that discipline, technique, fundamentals, everything – that carries along no matter the personnel."

DE MARCUS DAVENPORT

On the emotional swing of taking and losing the lead: “I don’t know, I don’t really feel like we have emotional swings. For us, you know, it’s any chance that you get to get to get out there, that’s the mindset that we have. So anytime, it doesn’t matter what kind of play, we need to be able to reset and get back to doing our jobs. It was a good game, they had good plays, and we have to stop them. That’s our job.”

On Matt Ryan’s performance today: “He was really good. I think he is throwing a bit more, especially efficiently. I think he (Ryan) can move the ball quick, and they did enough to win. He (Ryan) did enough to win.

On frustration of not getting to Matt Ryan to complete a sack: “I think the biggest thing with that frustration was that we didn’t win. I would have been okay with nothing myself if we would have won, so we just have to do more.”

On his instruction to let the Falcons score on the play before the ball came loose: “It was less about that. It was more, if you have the chance to get the ball out, take it. That’s pretty much what we should have done. It kind of became one of those situations, like I said, where I felt I should have done more finishing that play.”

(On the 64-yard reception at the end of the game): "It was a great play by CP. The call we had on had multiple options across the board. I saw that it was man-to-man coverage with an opportunity for him on the sideline. He ran a great route and made a really good catch. As he has done all year, he stepped up and made a big play for us."

(On how big this win is): "They are all big. Regardless of who you go against in this league, it's hard to win a game. It's a tough place. I've played here a lot. You don't know how difficult it is to play in this environment. It's a hard earned win."

(On the team's mindset once the Saints took the lead): "Let's go win the game. Let's find a way to get the job done. There was a minute and a few seconds and we had two timeouts. There was plenty of time to get a field goal and go win. We just need to figure out a way to get the job done."

(On the long drive before the half) "We were on the 8. To do that before the half and finished it with a touchdown, was huge for us. You know with this defense it's going to be tough sledding and there are going to be negative plays. You have to create explosives and you have to convert first downs. I thought that we did a pretty good job of that."

RB #84 CORDARRELLE PATTERSON

(On today's game): "It was awesome. They came back. They fought hard. You have to give credit to the whole Saints organization. They are a great team. We just found a way to get it done. It was a must win for us. We were executing all week."

(On the 64-yard reception near the end of the game): "It was a play we called earlier in the first drive. Coach (Smith) told me that we were going to call that play again. Matt (Ryan) trusted me. I was open. I just try to build his trust each and every week. He gave me an opportunity to go out there and make a play."

(On the matchup of the big reception): "It's just about getting open. I'm just trying to let the defender not get hands on me, so I can get open. We ran that play earlier and coach said that we were going to come back to it and that's what we did."

(On what Matt Ryan says in the huddle on the final drive): "Matt Ryan says let's go get it done. That is just Matty Ice. He is not nervous. He has been doing this his whole career. He has been bringing teams back. That's what he does. We just trust the leader."

WR #17 OLAMIDE ZACCHEAUS

(On the touchdowns he had today): "It was a huge possession to put points on the board at the end of the half and also at the end of the game. It got us in position to win the game. I was doing my part and doing what I was supposed to do. I try to contribute on how I can."

(On what was working on the 92-yard drive before the end of the first half): "Everybody was doing their job. It really is. Everyone was on the same page. It helps the defense when you have a big lead."

(On if you feel comfortable winning games at the end): "I don't think you can ever feel comfortable in this league. Once you get comfortable, then that's when you start losing. I don't think that we will every be comfortable."

OLB #93 JAMES VAUGHTERS

(On his sack fumble) "First of all I want to dedicate that play to both of my grandfathers. They were both military men. This week is (Salute to) service week. We wear the towels and the gloves to show that appreciation. My maternal grandfather passed (away) about three weeks ago. It was very emotional for me playing. It is always emotional for me playing in the (salute to) service game because they did that so I could have the opportunity to be a pro football player. I want to dedicate that to them. I wish they could have been here to see it. I know they are watching (this performance) from above. That is something I really appreciate. On the sack itself, it's a culmination of the efforts of

everyone on this team. The offense is making plays. Other guys on the defense are making plays. We withstood the surge from the other team. I was glad I was able to make the strip sack to help us get the win today.”

(On if the thought of them was on his mind today): “I was thinking about them right before that drive. My (first) home game active as an NFL player was just two years ago. That was during (salute to) service week too. I think about them. My (maternal) grandfather was from rural Alabama and my paternal grandfather was from rural Ohio. I get an opportunity to be an NFL player. They were from more or less places where they do not get that opportunity. I always think about them when I have this opportunity. That’s really what it is all about. It’s about me being a representation of my family.”

(On appreciating his journey as an NFL player): “Absolutely, it could weigh me down, but I use it as an opportunity to fuel me. I try to win each individual play. If I don’t win that one, then I’m trying to win the next one. I’m just glad that I can be around guys who can share that moment. We all play as a representation of that journey.”

What were some of the things you found out about Trevor Siemian in his first start for the Saints?

“Yeah, look he graded out pretty well. I thought the decisions came quickly, you know, he got us in and out of a number of different plays. I think we could have helped him more, you know, outside with some of the playmakers. I felt like we had our hands on a few balls and watching the tape we did. I'd say pretty steady, pretty calm demeanor, especially, you know, when we fell behind in those final drives, he made enough plays really (and) got us back in the game. So overall, I was pleased.”

The running game was going well early, what changed during the game to get away from it?

“Yeah, that's a good question. Look, you're evaluating the tape early and we're getting some pretty good chunks. We ended up in some long yardage situations, too many offensive penalties, I'll be honest with you, it was frustrating watching the tape today and Atlanta did a really good job in getting that win. We're trying to focus on not only just that game, but the technique and the details that are going to move you forward and so they don't happen again. And so I just think there were a number of things that are teaching moments that we have to clean up and look at it's not cliché, we're still in that race to get better. And, you know, I hear the term margin for error, I don't know who has the margin for error really. I mean does this Buffalo have it? I don't know, they didn't play as well as they would have hoped and so in our league, there is a weekly margin for error and I think that the details matter so much that regardless, each week of who the games are, there's really good players on each side of the ball. So those are the things we're focused on this morning, cleaning up, and in the meetings, and making sure we see these things, and then addressing them. How do we go about fixing them? How do we go about becoming better with this technique?”

Are there any commonalities with the playmakers not making some of those plays or is it ball placement?

“I thought the ball placement was pretty good yesterday, just myself. We had one where I didn't like the location. But look, it's also finding ways to create separation, you know, we got a lot of man coverage yesterday. And so how do we find ways to get access and how do we find ways to get separation and we were able to do that in some cases. Deonte (Harris) had some big plays for us, obviously, some of our bunch sets even later in the two minute. I think that's the key.”

What are some of the ways you guys can go about creating that separation?

“Well, you can do it with formation, you can do it with motion and then you can do it with release patterns. So, you know, you line up in clusters and bunch, what we did for a number of these plays yesterday, which it forces you defensively, it's harder to get your hands on someone, you got to back off sometimes if the receivers are stacked. We had

a number of those type of formations yesterday. So we'll keep looking at that, but this league is filled with man to man coverage techniques, you know, and we're going to have to be able to beat that and handle that."

Do you feel like the penalties can be easily corrected?

"Well, it has to be. It's just hard to score in our league and it becomes a lot harder when you're 15 or 20 yards on the first down yet. So we have to be able to clean that up."

Was there any sort of common thread with the chunk plays Atlanta was able to get yesterday?

"Yeah, I'd say, look, we obviously want to be able to affect the quarterback better. If you just watch the game he had more than enough time and then there's some specifics in coverage that clearly we're better than and we can be better than and it's that attention to detail on that side of the ball, it's frustrating. But if those do not get cleaned up then you will consistently have periodic teams that have an open receiver through coverage. So we have to be better than that and we've got to also be able to apply pressure to the quarterback better."

Is the plan to stick with Trevor Siemian as the starting quarterback going forward now that Taysom Hill is healthy?

"We'll see what the plan is this week and each week and keep you posted."

Is the team going to put in a claim on Odell Beckham Jr.?

"Well, claiming deadlines today, no, it's impossible for us to put a claim in on the player. I mean you just have to look at the salary cap space and so. If we were going to be putting in a claim it wouldn't be something we discussed. I know it makes hit worthy news for everyone, but we wouldn't discuss that."

Was there a prevailing theme yesterday as to why y'all got less pressure on Matt Ryan than you would have liked until late in the game?

"I think we got to him, it was just the fact that he is a mobile quarterback. He kind of got out of the pressure a couple times, kept him in the pocket and kind of had to throw the ball. So many times we got close to him and he just took off. So I think to an extent, I think it was a percentage of pressure on him from my point of view."

When you have issues like that when you're just not affecting quarterback or anything like that as a defensive player, what are the things that you kind of focus in on saying oh, how do I get better like that?

"Oh, just like I said, I think from my point of view we got to him a couple times. It is just the times where we got close to him he got out of the pocket, he ran so that's how I see it from my point of view."

When you're looking at some of those explosives you guys gave up yesterday, what kind of sticks out about those in your mind just from your perspective on that D-Line?

"In that aspect I would say for us, get there, get there a little earlier, a little one second earlier quicker, try and have him not step up into his throws maybe, have him throw on his back for a bit. I think that's a way we could have affected that."

And then when you're given those plays up, what does that do a defense? You guys for the most part kind of kept them in check and then you have five or six big plays. Yeah, how do you kind of view just limiting those in general?

"I'll just say doing your job. Everyone do their job and execute their job, execute the game plan and the call at the highest ability. I think that would have helped."

How heartbreaking isn't lost like that losing to a division rival after the offense and the defense did enough in the fourth quarter, but just not at the end?

"Losing in general definitely isn't fun. I don't think there's anyone out there that likes to lose or goes out there that enjoy losing. (We are) getting the film today and see certain things and emphasize on those things and go from there."

What do you I guess make of you guy's offensive performance yesterday? And I guess specifically, how do you guys minimize the penalties that seem to haunt you yesterday?

"Really just going to the film, watching the film and just realizing the mistakes or the small things that we didn't do. We've just got to focus on attention to detail, and just small things."

When you are in a game like that, I guess how frustrating is it that it is mostly self-inflicted, and not to take credit away from the opponent, but a lot of it is self-inflicted?

"Yeah, I mean, that definitely hurts. Definitely a lot when it's self-inflicted, knowing you can avoid those things. But you've just got to move on and learn from it."

What do you make of the rally in the fourth quarter? Maybe you guys did piece it together there in that fourth quarter, you scored 22 points. How encouraging is that and I guess, does that make it more promising when you go into the next game saying, we see what the capabilities are?

"Yeah, definitely. In that fourth quarter, everything started to click, we didn't have penalties on us. Wasn't really any, like, self-inflicted wounds really. What we were doing in that quarter was doing everything that we have been practicing. So just seeing that. We know what we're capable of. Just got to minimize the small things."

Just from the offensive line's perspective, what's it been like working with Trevor Siemian these last few games?

"They've (quarterbacks) been great. Trevor, obviously, he's played quarterback in this league before. He's been doing it for a while. So him coming in, he's comfortable, he comes in and does his job, he leads us and he's doing a great job."

What do you think this offense, if you can put your finger on it on anything, what does it need to do just kind of achieve that week to week consistency and kind of be where you want to be at the end of each game?

"This offense, I think we have a really talented group. I feel like just going into each week, focusing on those small things, attention to small details and going out there and performing. That way, the small things that you should be focusing on all week, you're doing in the game. I think that's one thing that's going to help us just continue to strive."
