

addition to serving the Saints in the summer. A contract has been signed with the complex assuring the team of a


summer home into 1985.

# JOHN W. MECOM, JR.

# EDDIE JONES President



Entering his 16th season as an owner in the National Football League, John W. Mecom, Jr., 42, brings maturity and vitality to the task of building a winner in New Orleans.

Enthusiasm best characterizes his approach to duties as chief executive of the Saints.

Mecom was awarded the Saints franchise on December 15, 1966 and became, at age

27, the youngest owner in NFL history. His youthful entry into the NFL was surpassed by an early involvement in the Mecom family business. At an early age, he began on-the-job training at the hand of his father, the late John Mecom, Sr., learning the daily workings of the Mecom enterprisés from the ground up.

He now sits at the head of the Mecom family business network that includes wide-ranging interests in oil, sulphur, ranches and hotels, including the exclusive Warwick and Towers in Houston, Texas.

In addition to his efforts to bring a winning tradition to the Saints, Mecom's philanthropic efforts in New Orleans have benefitted several civic concerns. For example, nearly \$2 million has been raised for the Saints-Lions Eye and Ear Clinic through the Saints' sponsorship of an annual preseason game to benefit the Louisiana Lions Club. A Mecom contribution resulted in the restoration of the locker rooms at Tad Gormley Stadium, a football facility in New Orleans' City Park used by many of the area high schools.

Mecom has also positioned the Saints to assist with funding for a Ronald McDonald House, a support facility for the city's medical community. He has made substantial contributions toward the construction of a playground for handicapped children (Independence Isle), and his generosity made possible the recent implementation of a human performance center at Southern Baptist Hospital.

Mecom was born in Houston, Texas, Oct. 11, 1939. He attended the universities of Oklahoma and Texas and played freshman football at Oklahoma. He is a member of Sigma Alpha Epsilon.

At Oklahoma he met Katsy Mullendore of Pawhuska, Oklahoma. They were married in 1962.

His avid interest in sports includes auto racing. In 1966, John and John Sr. sponsored the winning entry (driven by Graham Hill) in the Indianapolis 500 auto race classic.

John and Katsy reside in Houston, but also maintain a residence in New Orleans. They have four children: John III, Katsy, Mary Elizabeth and Kathleen.



Eddie Jones returned to the New Orleans Saints as president in February, 1982 after serving two years as vice-president with the John Mecom Co. in Houston, Texas.

He first joined the Saints staff in 1968 as business manager and served in that capacity until 1973 when he was appointed treasurer.

In 1977 he was named vice-president. He was appointed executive vice-president prior

to the 1978 campaign and guided franchise operations until joining the Mecom Co. fulltime following the 1979 season.

During Jones' tenure as executive vice-president, the Saints enjoyed the two best seasons in franchise history, gaining a 7-9 record in 1978 and 8-8 in 1979.

In addition to his role as Saints president, he continues to oversee the wideranging business interests of John Mecom, Jr., of which the Saints are a vital part.

A native of Houston, Texas, Jones grew up in Denham Springs, Louisiana and was an all-state basketball player at Denham Springs High School. He graduated from Louisiana State University with a degree in accounting. He worked for Arthur Andersen & Co. as a Certified Public Accountant before joining the Saints.

An Air Force veteran, Jones and his wife Marilyn have three children: Wendy, Todd and Jeffrey. They reside in Houston.

# FRED WILLIAMS Vice-President Administration



Fred Williams was named vice-president of administration in 1982 after directing front office operations as assistant to the president during the 1981 season.

He prepared to direct the club's administration by serving as assistant to owner John Mecom, Jr. beginning in 1971. In that position he gained firsthand experience in every aspect of franchise operations.

His association with the Saints began in 1968 when he joined the Mecom family as a security consultant.

Williams is the first native New Orleanian to head Saints administrative operations. He attended Fortier High School and Tulane University.

Prior to joining the Saints, Williams pursued a law enforcement career in New Orleans and served as head of the district attorney's Rackets Bureau. He also served four years in the Marine Corps with special duty in the United Nations peace-keeping force in Palestine.

Williams and his wife Jessie live in Slidell. They have five children: Lynn, Jeff, Kevin, Amy and Christopher.

# O.A. (BUM) PHILLIPS HEAD COACH/GENERAL MANAGER



The result of O.A. (Bum) Phillips' first season at the helm of the New Orleans Saints has been characterized as "foundations for the future".

And from George Rogers' league-leading rushing attack to an improved defense that allowed no running back 100 yards or more, the 1981 campaign provided a solid base for what Bum set out to accomplish with a young, revamped roster.

"We got done most of what we set out to do," Phillips affirmed.

"The team played with enthusiasm, and week in and week out they did what we asked of them.

"When you go to build a house, you don't start on the sixth floor, you start on the foundation. Last year we proved that we could run the ball and stop the run. Our players never gave up in any game.

"Those are some of the things that we wanted to establish here from the beginning, and it's a tribute to our assistant coaches that those things were accomplished.

"Our new staff came together quickly. I've never seen a group of assistants so effective the first year, and they deserve the credit for anything we were able to do last year. I'd bet my life on them. I've already bet my job on them."

On Feb. 17, 1982, the title of general manager was added to that job. The GM title went along with responsibilities that Bum had, in fact, held since he was appointed head coach Jan. 22, 1981.

Regardless of titles, Bum's task in year two is continued progress. He's used his formula successfully before.

During six seasons, 1975-80, as head coach of the Houston Oilers, Phillips raised that franchise to a perennial playoff contender. Prior to his arrival in Houston, the Oilers had turned in back-to-back seasons in which they won only a single game.

After serving as a defensive assistant on the San Diego Chargers staff, 1967-71, he joined the Houston Oilers as defensive coordinator in 1974. The Oilers went 7-7, a vast improvement over successive 1-13 seasons the two previous years.

In 1975 Bum took over as head coach and general manager and guided Houston to a 10-4 record, defeated every team on the schedule except Pittsburgh and Cincinnati and narrowly missed the AFC playoffs.

Following seasons of 5-9 in 1976 and 8-6 in 1977, Bum directed the

Oilers into the playoffs, 1978-79-80. Houston appeared in the conference championship games of 1978 (10-6) and 1979 (11-5), but lost to eventual Super Bowl champion Pittsburgh both times. The Oilers again made the playoffs in 1980 (11-5) and were stopped by Oakland, also the eventual Super Bowl champion.

During those three successive years of playoff appearances, Bum's team won four of its seven post-season games.

Born in Orange, Texas Sept. 29, 1923, Phillips' coaching career has included 13 years at the high school level, six at the college level and six years as a pro assistant.

His seven-year record as an NFL head coach is 59-45, plus four postseason victories.

His college coaching background includes service as an assistant at Texas A&M, 1957; Houston, 1963-66; Southern Methodist, 1971-72; and Oklahoma State, 1973.

A Marine Corps veteran, Phillips played guard at Lamar Junior College, 1941 and 1946-47, and at Stephen F. Austin, 1948-49.

Warmth, consideration and cooperativeness are among the personal qualities that earned him the 1979 Jack Horrigan "Good Guy" Award presented annually by the Professional Football Writers of America.

Bum has given his personal efforts to several charitable projects, including fund raising for the Hughen School/Bob Hope High School in Port Arthur, Texas. The Bum Phillips Celebrity Golf Tournament in Port Arthur has raised well over \$1 million for the educational facility for the severely handicapped. Last summer, Bum initiated a celebrity tournament in New Orleans to benefit Multiple Sclerosis.

Bum and his wife Helen head a family of six children and three grandchildren. Son Wade is the Saints' defensive coordinator. The five Phillips daughters are: Susan (Reeh), Cicely (Devore), Dee Jean (Hurta), Andrea and Kim Ann.

# HARRY HULMES Director of Football Operations



Harry Hulmes is in his 13th year with the Saints. He has served as vice-president of player personnel (1978-79) and vice-president administration (1973-77).

Hulmes came to New Orleans from the Baltimore Colts where he served 12 years as business manager and director of public relations (1958-66), and interim general manager (1967-69).

A native of Philadelphia, Hulmes grad-

uated from the University of Pennsylvania. He joined the Baltimore Orioles as assistant business manager in 1954. He became sports information director at Bucknell University in 1956. He enjoyed two NFL Championship seasons with the Colts.

A navy veteran, Hulmes and his wife, Barbara, reside in Metairie. They have three children: Linda and Terry, both married, and Richie. Also serving Green Bay as assistant general manager, Peppler was a vital part of the Packers organization that won the NFL title in 1965 and successive Super Bowls in 1967 and 1968.

Peppler moved to the Miami Dolphins as director of pro scouting in 1971 and again played a part in successive Super Bowl victories, 1973 and 1974.

He joined the Atlanta Falcons in 1975 as general manager and served as interim head coach for nine games in 1976.

A Baltimore native, Peppler has six children: Pamela (Nickoli), Susan (Hamachek), Walter, Terry, John and Jim. He also has four grandchildren.

# PAT PEPPLER Director of Player Negotiations



Pat Peppler is in his second season with the Saints after serving with the Houston Oilers (1977-80) as assistant general manager.

A graduate of Michigan State University, Peppler played football, basketball and baseball. After a brief stint in pro baseball, he coached in Michigan high schools, and then spent eight years as an assistant football coach at North Carolina State.

One season on staff at Wake Forest followed before Peppler joined the Green Bay Packers as director of player personnel under Vince Lombardi.



Jack Cherry joined the Saints in 1981 from private business.

Cherry began his sports career as a writer for the Columbus (Ohio) Evening Dispatch. After serving at the Lancaster Evening Gazette, he was named Sports Information Director at his alma mater, Xavier (Ohio), and worked there 1958-71. He was appointed assistant SID at Louisiana State University in 1972. He

served as SID at Kansas in 1973, and moved to the Houston Texans of the WFL in 1974. In 1975, he joined the Houston Oilers as director of media services, and was named director of public relations in 1976.

Cherry was head of his own television production company, 1978-80.

Jack and his wife, Barbara, have four children: Jack, Lisa Anne, Patrick, and Tom. They live in Destrehan.

# **Coaching Staff**

# **KING HILL, Offensive Coordinator**



King Hill is in his 25th year in the NFL. This is his second season with the Saints.

Hill graduated from Rice University after leading the Owls to the Southwest Conference championship in 1957 as an all-America quarterback. He was chosen by the Chicago Bears in the 1958 NFL draft, the first player selected. He quarterbacked the 1958 College All-Stars to a rare victory over the pros.

Hill played 12 seasons in the NFL with the

Bears (1958-60), Philadelphia Eagles (1961-67), Minnesota Vikings (1968), and St. Louis Cardinals (1969). He still holds the Eagles' record for longest touchdown pass (92 yards).

In 1978, Hill joined the Houston Oilers' staff as quarterbacks and receivers coach, and coached there through 1980. The Oilers reached the playoffs all three years.

A recently inducted member of the Rice University Hall of Fame, Hill was born in Freeport, Texas, November 8, 1936. He and his wife, Sharon, reside in Destrehan with their son, Cody.

# ANDY EVEREST, Tight Ends



Now in his second year with the Saints, Andy Everest was named tight ends coach during the past offseason.

Everest joined the Saints as a member of the scouting department in 1981, but worked with the tight ends throughout the season. He joined the staff from North Texas State, where he was assistant head coach (1973-78), and athletic director (1978-81).

In addition to his tenure at North Texas State, Everest has served at Utah (1953-57), Stanford (1958-62), Foothill College (1963-64), California-Santa Barbara (1965-71), and Southern Methodist (1972). He has coached football 28 years, 24 at the collegiate level.

Everest was born October 27, 1924 in Wichita Falls, Texas. Parents of four children, Tom, Alan, Andy and Kathy, Everest and his wife, Bonnie, live in Destrehan.

### WADE PHILLIPS, Defensive Coordinator

In its first year under Wade Phillips, 1981, the Saints defense improved in every category. Phillips graduated from Port Neches-Groves High School. He lettered in football, basketball, and baseball. He attended the University of Houston, and started three years at linebacker for the Cougars.

Phillips started his coaching career at Houston under Bill Yeoman in 1969. He later coach-

ed at Oklahoma State (1973-74), Kansas (1975), and Orange High School (1970-72).

As defensive line coach for the Houston Oilers, (1976-80), Phillips had at least one all-pro lineman each year.

Wade was born June 21, 1947 in Orange, Texas. He and his wife, Laurie, live in Destrehan with their children, Tracy and Wesley.

### JOHN LEVRA, Offensive Backfield



Under John Levra's direction, the Saints gained nearly 1,000 more yards rushing in 1981 than in 1980, and featured the NFL's leading rusher.

Now in his second season with the Saints, Levra coached for the British Columbia Lions in 1980.

John played linebacker at Pittsburg (Kan.) State. After seven years in Kansas high schools

(1959-65), he started coaching in the collegiate ranks as assistant at New Mexico Highlands in 1966, and was head coach, 1967-70. His four-year record was 35-4-1. He moved to Stephen F. Austin State as head coach and athletic director (1971-74) where his football teams were 18-5 in his final two seasons and made the only bowl appearance in school history. He moved to Kansas State as offensive coordinator (1975-78), and assumed the same position at North Texas State (1979).

John was born in Arma, Kansas, October 2, 1937. He and his wife, Rosie, have two children, Craig and Gina. They live in Destrehan.

### CARL MAUCK, Offensive Line



Carl Mauck joined the Saints staff in May 1982 after an NFL playing career that spanned 13 years with four teams. He is assigned to work with the offensive line along with coach Joe Spencer.

Mauck played center with the Baltimore Colts, Miami Dolphins and San Diego Chargers before joining the Oilers in a trade from San Diego in 1975.

During his playing career, he appeared in 156 consecutive games and started 155 consecutive.

He retired from the Oilers following the 1981 season and was scheduled to begin a radio show in the Houston area before joining the Saints staff.

Mauck entered the NFL from Southern Illinois University in 1969 as the no. 13 draft choice of the Colts.

He was coached by O.A. (Bum) Philips six years at Houston and two years at San Diego.

Mauck is a native of McLeansboro, Illinois where he was born July 7, 1947. He and wife Vicki have four children: Timothy, Chrissy, Teresa and Cathy.

LAMAR McHAN, Wide Receivers

Lamar McHan is in his seventh year as a Saints coach.

McHan joined the Saints as quarterbacks coach under John North (1974-75). He returned in 1978 as quarterbacks and receivers coach under Dick Nolan, and developed the Saints passing attack into one of the most respected in the NFL.

An all-America quarterback at the University

of Arkansas and No. 1 draft choice of the Chicago Cardinals, McHan played with the Cardinals (1954-58), Green Bay Packers (1959-60), Baltimore Colts (1961-62), and San Francisco 49ers (1963). He coached at Northern Arizona (1969-70), and Texas-Arlington (1971-73).

McHan is a native of Lake Village, Arkansas, where he was born December 16, 1932. He and his wife, Barbara, have three children, Lance, Lisa, and Megan. They reside in Metairie.

# **RUSSELL PATERNOSTRO, Strength**



Russell Paternostro started his pro coaching career in 1981 with the Saints after success at training both individuals and teams at every level of competition.

A New Orleans native, Paternostro graduated from West Jefferson High School, and attended San Diego State University. He played football in high school and also at Camp Pendleton, California, during his Navy tour of duty.

Paternostro returned to New Orleans in 1962, and was involved with health clubs in the New Orleans area.

Paternostro was born July 21, 1940 in New Orleans. He and his wife, Mercy, have two daughters, Angela and Robyn. They reside in New Orleans.

# HAROLD RICHARDSON, Special Teams



Harold Richardson began his pro coaching career with the Saints in 1981 after coaching ten years at the college level.

A tight end at Southern Methodist University, Richardson played on one of only two Mustang teams to win the Southwest Conference championship in 34 years. He also was an all-conference selection in baseball, and lettered two years for the Mustangs.

Richardson coached at SMU after graduating (1971-72), and moved to Oklahoma State (1973-76). He was on the staff at Texas Christian (1977-78) before becoming defensive coordinator at North Texas State (1978-80).

A native Texan, Richardson was born September 27, 1944 in Houston. He and his wife, Ramona, live in Destrehan.

#### **JOE SPENCER**, Offensive Line



Joe Spencer joined the Saints in 1981 with 26 years of coaching experience.

Spencer played offensive tackle at Oklahoma State. He then played professionally with the Brooklyn Dodgers (1948), Cleveland Browns (1949-50), and Green Bay Packers (1951-52).

- Mar. 8 First season-ticket drive launched and Saints sell 20,000 first day and 33,400 before first league game.
- Mar. 14 Saints make fullback Les Kelley of Alabama top choice in common draft.
- July 1 Seventy-six players (mostly rookies) report for first training camp at California Western University in San Diego.
- Former Green Bay fullback great Jim Taylor signs with Saints. July 6
- July 8 -Veterans report to training camp.
- Bert Rose appointed executive vice-president and general July 25 manager.
- Saints lose first pre-season game to Los Angeles, 16-7, be-Aug. 2 fore 26,364 at Anaheim, Calif.
- Saints score first pre-season victory by beating St. Louis, 23-Aug. 12 14, before 25,500 at Shreveport, La.
- Saints record first pre-season victory in New Orleans downing Sept. 9 Atlanta, 27-14, before 67,486. Victory gave Saints 5-1 preseason record, best ever for a first-year expansion team.
- Saints open season losing to Los Angeles, 27-13, after rookie Sept. 17 John Gilliam returned opening kickoff 94 yards for touchdown.
- Saints earn first NFL victory beating Philadelphia, 31-24, as Nov. 5 Walt Roberts scores three touchdowns at Tulane Stadium.
- Saints defeat Washington, 30-14, as rookie Danny Abramo-Dec. 17 wicz scores two touchdowns. Saints wind up with 3-11 record and equal win output for first-year expansion team. Cornerback Dave Whitsell's 10 interceptions tie for best in NFL and earn UPI Comeback Player of Year honors along with second-team All-Pro recognition and invitation to Pro Bowl.

## 1968

- Vic Schwenk replaces Bert Rose as general manager. Mar. 29
- Wide receiver Dave Parks signs with Saints after playing out July 7 option at San Francisco.

- July 26 Kevin Hardy, plus No. 1 draft choice of 1969, awarded to 49ers as compensation for Parks.
- Sept. 10 Jim Taylor announces retirement. Nov. 3
  - Saints to lose to Dallas, 17-3, before home-record crowd of 84,728 at Tulane Stadium.
- Dec. 15 Saints defeat Pittsburgh, 24-14, in season's windup to emerge with 4-9-1 record and third-place finish in Century Division. Saints' two-year record of 7-20-1, best ever for an expansion team. Defensive tackle Dave Rowe named to play in Pro Bowl.

- Oct. 5 Saints' Tom Dempsey kicks 55-yard field goal against Rams at Los Angeles. Kick was NFL's longest that season and one yard short of pro football record.
- Nov. 2 Saints snap six-game losing streak at St. Louis, 51-42. Game sets NFL record of most total touchdowns in one game via passing with Bill Kilmer and Charlie Johnson connecting on six apiece. Five other Saints records set: Most first downs (26), most total offensive yards (508), most passing yards (354), most points (51), and most PATs (6).
- Nov. 16 Tom Dempsey sets Saints record with 4 field goals against Giants in New York, scoring fourth with 11 seconds left to pull out 25-24 victory. Win began three-game Saints' victory streak as New Orleans also downed San Francisco, 43-38 and Philadelphia, 26-17,
- Dec. 21 Saints close third season with 27-24 victory over Pittsburgh to bring record to 5-9. Dan Abramowicz wins NFL receiving championship with 73 catches for 1.015 vards and 7 TDs and All-NFL honors. Saints continue to hold NFL expansion team winning record with three-year report of 12-29-1. Defensive end Doug Atkins retires after 17-year NFL career. wins second team All-Pro honors. Tom Dempsey, Jake Kupp, Tony Baker and Andy Livingston tapped for Pro Bowl with entire Saints coaching staff.

- Jan. 16 In realignment of National Conference, Saints form Western Division with Los Angeles, San Francisco and Atlanta. Nov. 3
  - J. D. Roberts replaces Tom Fears and becomes the second head coach in Saints' history.
- Tom Dempsey kicks 63-yard field goal-longest in NFL history Nov. 8 -on final play to defeat Detroit, 19-17.

- Jan. 28 Saints draft quarterback Archie Manning of Ole Miss in first round after trading guarterback Bill Kilmer to Washington for linebacker Tom Roussel plus 4th and 8th picks in 1972 draft.
- Aug. 11 Louisiana Superdome construction begins.

- Sept. 19 Saints upset Rams in season's opener in New Orleans, 24-20. Rookie Archie Manning makes first regular-season start and runs for one-yard touchdown on final play after hitting 16 of 29 passes for 218 yards and another touchdown.
- Oct. 17 Archie Manning rushes for two touchdowns as Saints defeat Cowboys, 24-20, before 83,088 at New Orleans. Cowboys went on to win Super Bowl.

- Dec. 3 Saints beat 49ers, 24-13, at Superdome to become first New Orleans team to win six games.
- Dec. 17 Saints end season with 7-9 record after win at Tampa Bay, 17-10. Quarterback Archie Manning named Player of Year and MVP in National Conference and selected to play in Pro Bowl Game.

- June 5 Saints move administrative office from Lee Circle to Super-
- Oct. 14 Saints score 42 points in second half for club record in 42-14 win at Tampa Bay. Scores came on six successive possessions in offensive masterpiece.
- Oct. 28 Saints tie club record of three consecutive wins and move into undisputed first place in National Conference with 14-10 win at Washington. Saints stopped Redskins 18 times with goal to go and 7 times within 2-yard line in defensive masterpiece.
- Dec. 3 Chuck Muncie rushes for 128 yards to become first Saint to surpass 1,000-yard milestone en route to 1,198-yard season. Saints, alas, saw 35-14 lead disappear in 42-35 loss to Oakland in Monday night TV game at Superdome.
- Dec. 16 Saints end most successful eight-win season by beating Super Bowl-bound Rams, 29-14, in last game for Rams at Coliseum. Ironically, Rams beat Saints in their first game at Tulane Stadium.
- Dec. 20 Steve Rosenbloom is introduced as new executive vicepresident and general manager of Saints at Superdome news conference.

## 1980

- Jan. 27 Chuck Muncie is selected MVP as National Conference scores 37-27 win in Pro Bowl at Hawaii. Saints also represented well by Archie Manning, Tommy Myers, Wes Chandler and Henry Childs.
- Nov. 25 Dick Stanfel replaces Dick Nolan as head coach for remaining four games of season.
- Dec. 14 Saints defeat New York Jets, 21-20, at Shea Stadium for New Orleans' only victory of the season.

## **RULE CHANGES**, 1982

Several changes in National Football League rules for 1982 were approved by the owners at the league meetings. They are:

- Reduced the penalty for incidental grasp of the face mask by the defense from a loss of five yards and a first down to a loss of five yards only.
- Further clarified the definition of legal reception of a forward pass and specified that there is no possession when the ball comes loose simultaneously with the receiver performing acts necessary to establishing possession.
- Clarified the rule that there is no interference if there is any question that the action causing incidental interference is simultaneous to the pass being touched.
- 4. Required players to cover their hip pads with their outer uniform.
- 5. Established officiating mechanics for timing the 10-second count when it becomes necessary by rule.
- The offensive team will no longer be required to show a double shift three times in the game outside the opponent's 20-yard line before it uses a double shift inside the 20-yard line.
- 7. Eliminated the provision in the rule book that allowed coaches to mutually agree upon shortening the length of a game.
- Reduced the penalty for an illegal bat or kick from a loss of 15 yards to a loss of 10 yards.
- 9. Gave clubs the option of marking the solid white border surrounding the field wider than the present six feet.

LOCKER ROOMS: Only accredited working media are allowed in locker rooms after the games. There is no admission before the game.


