## **THE MATCHUP**

The 2-1 New Orleans Saints return to the Caesars Superdome on Sunday after a two game road trip to take on the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. The NFC South rivals have faced off 62 times in the regular season, with New Orleans holding a 39-23 series lead and Tampa Bay taking a 2020 NFC Divisional Playoff matchup.

The Saints have gotten off to a 2-1 start in 2023, tied for first place in the NFC South with Tampa Bay and Atlanta, looking to rebound this week from a road bump of an 18-17 loss last Sunday at the Green Bay Packers. With starter Derek Carr being forced to leave Sunday's contest with a shoulder injury, a week of practice and rehab will play a role in the evaluation of whether Carr or Jameis Winston receive the start against the Buccaneers. Whoever is behind center will have the opportunity to work with the prolific wideout trio of Michael Thomas, Chris Olave and Rashid Shaheed, a group that combines consistency with the ability to make big plays. Running back Alvin Kamara will also make his 2023 debut Sunday.

Defensively, Head Coach Dennis Allen's unit has been among the most dominant in the league again to start the season. All three levels have contributed to the Black and Gold being ranked in the top ten in the NFL in both total defense and opponent points per game. Defensive end Carl Granderson leads the team with 2.5 sacks and one forced fumble, while linebacker Demario Davis and cornerback Marshon Lattimore continue to be among the NFL's

best at their positions. A pair of draft picks in linebacker Pete Werner (2021), who leads the team with 26 tackles and cornerback Alontae Taylor (2022), who had a careerhigh five passes defensed on Sunday also show promise.

After three seasons with Tom Brady, the Buccaneers turned to a new signal caller this offseason, signing free agent quarterback Baker Mayfield. Despite this and other personnel/coaching staff changes, they have started off fast at 2-1 also with wins over NFC North opponents Chicago and Minnesota. The Buccaneers' wideout duo of Mike Evans and Chris Godwin have helped Mayfield make a smooth transition. On the defensive side of the ball, they are still the stingy unit of recent years that is led by defensive-minded head coach, Todd Bowles, and their linebacking core of Devin White, Lavonte David and Shaquil Barrett- all of whom have been selected to at least one All-Proteam.

Meetings between the Saints and Buccaneers have been ultra-competitive battles in recent years. Both defenses have been the story in the last three meetings between the clubs, with the winning teams' average score being just 15 points and New Orleans shutting out Tampa Bay en route to a 9-0 victory back in 2021. Fans can expect a physical game on Sunday between elite defenses with special teams units playing a major role.

**Around the NFC South:** The Atlanta Falcons (2-1) play the Jacksonville Jaguars (1-2) at London's Wembley Stadium at 8:30 a.m. CT and the Carolina Panthers (0-3), play at the Minnesota Vikings (0-3) at 12:00 CT.

## THE COACHES

Dennis Allen was hired as the 17th head coach in New Orleans Saints history on February 8, 2022. Now in his 28th year coaching and 21st in the NFL, Allen has spent 13 seasons in New Orleans in two separate stints, including the six-and-a half campaigns (2015-21) as the team's defensive coordinator prior to being promoted to head coach. He succeeded Sean Payton, who coached the team for 16 seasons, including the 2009 campaign, when Allen was secondary coach and ended with the Super Bowl XLIV championship. When Allen took control of a Black and Gold defense in Week 11 of the 2015 season that was ranked 32nd both in opponent net yards per game and opponent points per game, he methodically molded a unit that has finished in the top 10 in both categories each of the last three years. From 2017 to the present, New Orleans is the only defense in the NFL to rank in the top five in the National Football League in both opponent rushing yards per game and sacks.

In his first year as head coach of the Saints, Allen guided New Orleans through the challenge of significant injuries at several positions to win three of their last four games after a Week 14 bye and give up 20 or fewer points in the final eight contests of the season, ten points apiece in the final three. Carrying over to the 2023 season, where New Orleans has started 2-1, the Saints have surrendered 20 or fewer points in a franchise-record 11 consecutive games.

Before rejoining the Saints coaching staff in 2015, Allen served as head coach of the Oakland Raiders from 2012-14 and as defensive coordinator of the Denver Broncos in 2011. Prior to his first stint in New Orleans from 2006-10, Allen was also an assistant with the Atlanta Falcons from 2002-05, where he received his NFL coaching start.

Over the course of his coaching career in New Orleans, Allen has coached linebacker Demario Davis and defensive end Cameron Jordan to career seasons. Davis has led the team in tackles in every campaign since signing with the club as an unrestricted free agent in 2018 and has garnered *AP* All-Pro honors four straight times. Since Allen returned to New Orleans in 2015, his 86.5 sacks rank third in the NFL.

Allen played safety at Texas A&M from 1992-95, where he started the final 21 games of his college career before being signed as an undrafted free agent by the Buffalo Bills in 1996. Prior to entering the National Football League coaching ranks in 2002, Allen served as a graduate assistant at his alma mater from 1996-99 and as secondary coach at the University of Tulsa from 2000-2001. He earned a bachelor of business administration degree and a master's in kinesiology from Texas A&M.

Raised in Hurst, Texas, Allen and his wife, Alisson, have

a daughter, Layla and a son, Garrison.

**Todd Bowles** was hired as the 13<sup>th</sup> head coach in Buccaneers history on March 30, 2022. He enters his second season as head coach and 28<sup>th</sup> in the National Football League. In his first campaign in 2022, he led the Buccaneers to an 8-9 record and NFC South Division title.

Prior to his promotion, he spent the previous three seasons as defensive coordinator and was instrumental in helping Tampa Bay win Super Bowl LV against the Kansas City Chiefs, holding Andy Reid and Patrick Mahomes offense to just nine points. Under his command, from 2019-2021 the defensive unit was third in the league in both takeaways (82) and sacks (142) as one of only two teams in the league to be top five in both categories. In addition, the Buccaneers defense led the NFL in rushing yards allowed per game, yards per attempt, fumble recoveries, and passes defensed. In six postseason games as DC during that span, his unit tallied 16 takeaways, seven more than any other club.

Bowles spent 2015-2018 as head coach of the New York Jets, where he led them to 10 wins in his first season. In the 2013-2014 seasons, he served as defensive coordinator for the Arizona Cardinals. During that span, Arizona's defense ranked top five in rushing touchdowns allowed, points per game, rushing yards per game and interceptions. In 2014, he was honored as AP and PFWA Assistant Coach of the Year.

Earlier in his career, Bowles served as Defensive Backs Coach/ Interim Defensive Coordinator for the Philadelphia Eagles (2012), Assistant Head Coach/Secondary Coach for the Miami Dolphins (2008-2011), Secondary Coach of the Dallas Cowboys (2005-2007), Secondary Coach for the Cleveland Browns (2004), Defensive Nickel Package Coach for the Browns (2001-2003) and Secondary Coach for the New York Jets (2000) after starting with the Green Bay Packers Player Personnel Staff (1995-1996).

Bowles got his start coaching in 1997 as defensive coordinator for Morehouse College and went on to serve the same role for Grambling State (1998-99).

He enjoyed an eight year NFL career at the safety position after going undrafted in 1986 out of Temple. He was a member of the Washington Redskins (1986-90, 1992-93), starting on the 1987 team that won Super Bowl XXII, while also playing for the San Francisco 49ers (1991).

A native of Elizabeth, N.J., Bowles was born on Nov. 18, 1963. He and his wife, Taneka, have three sons, Todd Jr., Troy and Tyson.

#### SERIES HISTORY

The Saints and Buccaneers first met in 1977. New Orleans has posted a 39-23 regular season record vs. Tampa Bay, the club's best winning percentage (.629) vs. an opponent they've played at least of eight games against.

#### In the 63 games of the series there has been:

- •2,124 points scored by New Orleans, 1,151 allowed.
- A seven-game regular season New Orleans winning streak from 2011-2014 and from 2018-2021.
- A 18-10 record for the Saints in games played in New Orleans.
- 25 games decided by double-digits.
- Seven games decided by 21 or more points.
- 34 games decided by seven points or less.
- A 41-point win by New Orleans on December 16, 2012, the club's first shutout against the Buccaneers.
- Since both clubs joined the NFC South in 2002, New Orleans has swept the regular season series eight times.

New Orleans QB **Jameis Winston** won two ACC championships and one national championship at Florida State from 2013-14. Winston was the 2013 Heisman Trophy winner and was the first overall pick in the 2015 NFL Draft by the Buccaneers in 2015, holding passing yardage and touchdown pass franchise records, completing 1,563 –of-2548 passes for 19,737 yards with 121 touchdown passes in 72 games with 70 starts...New Orleans Defensive Coordinator **Joe Woods** served as a defensive quality control coach in Tampa Bay from 2014-15.

Offensive Assistant Jahri Evans - Evans was selected by the Saints in the fourth round (108th overall) of the 2006 NFL Draft and spent the first 11 seasons of his 12-year playing career with the Saints. Overall, he started 183 career regular season games at right guard for the Saints (2006-16) and Green Bay Packers (2017), 169 for the Black and Gold. Evans was a six-time Pro Bowl selection, a five-time Associated Press All-Pro and was named to the Pro Football Hall of Fame's 2020's All-Decade Team, as New Orleans finished in the Top Ten in total offense each of the 11 seasons he lined up for the Saints, while the 196 sacks surrendered by the offensive line over the period were the lowest in the NFC and second-lowest in the NFL. After being selected as a consensus All-Rookie in 2006. Evans was a Pro Bowl starter and consensus first-team All -Pro each season from 2009-12. He was inducted into the Saints Hall of Fame in 2020, the Louisiana Sports Hall of Fame in 2022 and was a semifinalist for the Pro Football Hall of Fame's Class of 2023.

Defensive Assistant **Matt Giordano** - Giordano was a fourth round draft pick of the Indianapolis Colts in 2005 and enjoyed a nine-year NFL career with the Colts (2005-08), Green Bay Packers (2009), Saints (2010), Oakland Raiders (2011-12) and St. Louis Rams (2013), starting 30-of-116 career games, accumulating 202 tackles, one sack, 11 interceptions, including two returned for touchdowns, 16 passes defensed, two forced fumbles, 52 special teams stop and one coverage fumble recovery. He also appeared in seven postseason games for the Colts and Packers and was a member of Indianapolis' Super Bowl XLI champion-ship team.

Secondary Coach Marcus Robertson - Robertson played in the NFL for 12 years with the Houston Oilers/Tennessee Titans (1991-00) and the Seattle Seahawks (2001-02) after entering the league with Houston as a fourth-round selection (102nd overall) in the 1991 NFL Draft out of Iowa State. Robertson was a first-team All-Pro at free safety in 1993 and 1997. The Pasadena, Calif. native finished his career by appearing in 162 games (144 starts), collecting 24 interceptions, 72 passes defensed, 11 fumble recoveries, nine forced fumbles and 795 tackles (638 solo).

Pass Rush Specialist **Brian Young** - Played in the National Football League from 2000-08 with the St. Louis Rams his first four seasons, who originally selected him in the fifth round of the 2000 NFL Draft (139th overall) from Texas-El Paso and final five campaigns with the Saints, playing in 124 games, recording 22.5 career sacks and eight fumble recoveries.

#### **BUCKING THE ODDS**

The Saints have a long tradition of finding players as free agents signed after the draft that make an impact immediately or developing their careers initially on the team's practice squad. Several Saints on the roster play key roles on offense, defense and special teams that the club developed. This trends for the competition battles in training camp/preseason

Wide receiver/return specialist Rashid Shaheed came to New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Weber State in 2022 after being one of the all-time best Division FCS returners and after spending the first five weeks on the practice squad, made an immediate impact, Oct. 16 vs. Cincinnati with a 44-yard rushing touchdown. He followed that up with a 53-yard touchdown reception on Oct. 20 at Arizona to become the only Saint to score a touchdown in each of his first two offensive touches. In the December 18 win over Atlanta, he finished with three receptions for 95 yards, with a 68-yard touchdown grab from Taysom Hill, the longest play from scrimmage of the season for New Orleans and the fifth-longest receiving TD by a Saints rookie all-time. On the Christmas Eve win at Cleveland in challenging conditions, Shaheed led the team in receiving with four grabs for 41 yards. In the January 1 victory at Philadelphia, he led the team in receiving for the third consecutive week, posting six receptions for 79 yards, including a 58-yard grab to set up a field goal. Overall, he carried four times for 57 yards with a 44-yard touchdown, caught 28 passes for 488 yards (17.4 avg.) with two TDs, returned 20 punts for 193 yards (9.7 avg.) and returned 14 kickoffs for 320 yards (22.9 avg.).

Tight end **Juwan Johnson** led his position group with four touchdown receptions in 2021, converting to the position after playing wide receiver in college and starting his Black and Gold career in 2020 as a wideout on the team's practice squad after signing as an undrafted free agent from Oregon. In 2022, he led his position group in receiving with 42 grabs for 508 yards with a club-best and career-high seven receiving touchdowns, tied for third at the position in the National Football League. Defensive end **Carl Granderson** played in 15 games in 2021 with three starts and posted 24 tackles and three sacks. In 2022, he posted 53 stops (30 solo) and a careerhigh 5.5 sacks, recovering the first fumble of his career on December 5 at Tampa Bay. In the Christmas Eve win at Cleveland, Granderson, sacked Browns QB Deshaun Watson at the Saints 22-yard line on fourth down with 19 seconds left in the fourth quarter to secure the win. The following week on January 1, 2023 at Philadelphia, he posted two stops, 1.5 sacks, one stop for loss and two quarterback hits, as Granderson posted at least half a takedown in three consecutive weeks for the first time in his career.

Earning the starting right end position in 2023, Granderson has posted nine tackles, leads the team with 2.5 sacks and has forced a fumble, signing a four-year contract extension on September 23. In Monday night's win over Carolina, Granderson had a standout performance with two solo tackles and a sack/forced fumble of Panthers rookie quarterback Bryce Young to save a potential score.

Punter **Lou Hedley** was signed following the 2023 NFL Draft by the Saints out of the University of Miami, where he played from 2019-22 and punted 206 times for 9,315 yards with a 45.2 gross punting average and 77 inside-the-20. The Australia native, who won the punting job in a punting competition in training camp at 30 years old earned All-ACC second-team honors in 2021 and was selected as a semifinalist for the Ray Guy Award, honoring the nation's top punter. In 2020, Hedley was recognized with *AP* second-team All-American honors and a Ray Guy Award finalist, as the Hurricanes ranked second in the FBS in net punting average.

Kicker **Blake Grupe** was signed by New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Notre Dame, where he played his graduate campaign in 2022, after handling kicking duties at Arkansas State from 2017-21. In 2022, he led the Fighting Irish with 91 points on 14-of-19 field goals and a perfect 49 -for-49 in PATs. The Missouri native was Arkansas State's career record holder in scoring (354), field goals (64) and PATs (162). In the 2023 preseason, Grupe secured a roster spot, by making five-of-six field goal attempts.

In the team's first two games, Grupe has made six of seven field goal attempts attempts and all four PAT attempts to lead the team with 22 points, while also tying for fifth in the NFL with 13 touchbacks on kickoffs.

Wide Receiver **Keith Kirkwood** originally joined the Saints as an undrafted free agent out of Temple in 2018. The New Jersey native spent the first two months of his rookie

season on the New Orleans practice squad, before being signed to the active roster at midseason and recording 13 receptions for 209 yards (16.1 avg.) with two touchdowns. He added one more scoring grab in the NFC Divisional playoff win over Philadelphia to help the Saints advance to the NFC Championship. After spending most of the 2019 campaign on Injured Reserve and playing for Carolina from 2020-21, Kirkwood returned to New Orleans in 2022, where he contributed on offense and special teams. In the 2023 preseason opening win over Kansas City, he caught a four-yard touchdown pass from QB Derek Carr.

#### PRACTICE MAKES PERFECT

A spot on the practice squad is another avenue to eventually get onto the active roster and have the opportunity to contribute. Below is an overview of eight key contributors players on the club's Week One 53-man roster with extensive practice squad experience.

TE **Juwan Johnson** was signed by New Orleans out of Oregon, where he spent his graduate transfer season, following the 2020 NFL Draft as a wideout. Recording four receptions for 39 yards in seven contests, Johnson spent the majority of his rookie season on the practice squad. Converted to tight end in 2021 and leading the position group with four touchdowns, Johnson took advantage of his first full offseason strength and conditioning program in 2022, led the tight ends group with 42 receptions for 508 yards with a club-best seven TD grabs, tied for third in the league at his position.

After spending his first three seasons with the Seattle Seahawks, contributing on both defense and special teams, DB **Ugo Amadi** split the 2022 campaign between the Titans active roster and the Kansas City Chiefs practice squad, also appearing in one contest for Kansas City. Possessing the versatility to play in multiple roles, Amadi secured a roster spot with the Saints in the preseason, recording eight tackles, one interception, two passes defensed and one coverage stop. He has contributed on both defense and special teams in three games.

After splitting his rookie season in 2018 between the practice squad and active roster, DV **J.T. Gray** enjoyed a breakthrough campaign in 2019, when he was selected *AP* second-team All-Pro when he recorded 16 special teams tackles, one blocked punt and one coverage fumble recovery. In 2021, he was selected as a first-team All-Pro and to his first career Pro Bowl (starter), when he led the NFL with 19 special teams tackles (league-leading 16 solo). Gray led the team with 12 special teams stops in 2022, despite missing three games with a hamstring, the third time in four seasons, he has led New Orleans in coverage tackles. After missing the 2023 opener with a shoulder injury, he has three stops in his last two contests.

WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed** came to New Orleans as one of the all-time best Division I-AA returners and after spending the first five weeks on the practice squad, made a quick impact on Oct. 16 vs. Cincinnati with a 44-yard rushing TD. With his 53-yard receiving touchdown on October 20 at Arizona, Shaheed became the only Saint to score touchdowns on each of his first two career offensive touches. In addition to finishing with 28 grabs for 488 yards (17.4 avg.) with two touchdowns, Shaheed also handled return duties for New Orleans since being activated, bringing back 20

punts for 193 yards (9.7 avg.). He made big contribution's in the Sept. 10 season opening win over Tennessee with a career-high 216 all-purpose yards, including five receptions for 89 yards, including a 19-yard touchdown and a late fourth quarter 41-yard grab to help secure the victory. In the Sept. 18 win over Carolina, he posted four catches for 63 yards (15.8 avg.), including a fourth quarter 45-yard grab. On Sunday at Green Bay, Shaheed had a 76-yard punt return for a touchdown.

Wide Receiver **Keith Kirkwood** originally joined the Saints as an undrafted free agent out of Temple in 2018. The New Jersey native spent the first two months of his rookie season on the New Orleans practice squad, before being signed to the active roster at midseason and recording 13 receptions for 209 yards (16.1 avg.) with two touchdowns. He added one more scoring grab in the NFC Divisional Playoff win over Philadelphia to help the Saints advance to the NFC Championship. After spending most of the 2019 campaign on Injured Reserve and playing for Carolina from 2020-21, Kirkwood returned to New Orleans in 2022, where he contributed on offense and special teams.

Fullback **Adam Prentice** was originally signed by Denver following the 2021 NFL Draft out of South Carolina. Joining the Saints at the conclusion of the 2021 preseason, Prentice appeared in seven games with three starts for New Orleans, carrying three times for five yards and catching three passes for 16 yards, while making one special teams stop. In 2022, he played in 11 games with two starts, rushing four times for nine yards, catching three passes for nine yards and also contributing on special teams with three tackles. Prentice recorded one coverage stop in the season opening win over Tennessee and has also contributed as a lead blocker in 2023.

LB **Nephi Sewell** was signed by New Orleans following the 2022 NFL Draft out of Utah and appeared in four games as a rookie, contributing on special teams, while spending the remainder of the campaign on the practice squad. Sewell has progressed on both defense and special teams and secured a spot on the 53-man roster, making his first two career coverage stops on Sunday at Green Bay.

Originally a third round draft pick of the Broncos in 2018, **Isaac Yiadom** has played in 72 games with 21 starts for Denver, the Giants, Green Bay, Houston and New Orleans and has posted 111 tackles, a split sack, one interception, 17 passes defensed, one forced fumble and 15 special teams stops. After starting 2022 with the Texans, Yiadom joined the Saints practice squad midway through the season and upon being signed to the active roster, recorded two special teams stops in six appearances. In the 2023 opening win over Tennessee, Yiadom contributed a special teams tackle and also tipped a pass to S Marcus Maye for an interception. On Sunday at Green Bay, he received the start and had a career-high four passes defensed.

# OFFENSIVE NOTES

Ahead is a synopsis of several returning players and newcomers through the draft and free agency to the 2023 Saints offensive line:

T/G James Hurst - A nine-year NFL veteran who was signed as a free agent from Baltimore in 2020, Hurst has 138 career regular season appearances with 83 starts at three different positions on the inside and outside. His versatility came in handy in 2020, as he started two contests at left tackle and one at left guard, while the Saints gained over 200 yards rushing each time. In 2021, Hurst moved into the lineup for eight games at left tackle in place of an injured Armstead, two at left guard in place of an injured Andrus Peat and three at right tackle for an injured Ryan Ramczyk. Hurst started 15 games at left tackle and one at left guard in 2022, the position he has opened three games at in 2023, while filling in at right guard on Sunday at Green Bay after Cesar Ruiz suffered a concussion.

RT Ryan Ramczyk - The Black and Gold used their second first round selection in the 2017 NFL Draft to snag Ramczyk out of the University of Wisconsin, one of the best offensive linemen in the entire draft. After opening all 16 games and both postseason contests in 2017 and being selected as a PFWA All-Rookie, he has been selected as an Associated Press All-Pro selection three times since. After missing seven contests in 2021, Ramczyk rebounded to open the first 16 games in 2022 and continues to anchor the right side of the line.

T/G Andrus Peat - A first round selection (13th overall) in the 2015 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Peat was considered one of the top college linemen in 2014. In his first eight seasons, he's played in 92 regular season games with 86 starts, opening a contest at every position except center. In 2020, he opened 13 contests at left guard as he was part of the NFC Pro squad for the third consecutive season. In 2021, he opened the first six contests, where New Orleans got off to a 4-2 start before suffering a season-ending pectoral injury. In his return to to the starting lineup in the 2022 season opener in Atlanta, New Orleans rushed for 151 yards. In back-to-back weeks, Peat was a part of rushing efforts of 200-yards plus by the club for the first time since 2020. On Sunday, Peat moved into left guard after a concussion suffered by Cesar Ruiz.

**C/G Erik McCoy** - New Orleans traded up in the second round of the 2019 NFL Draft to select this standout from Texas A&M, who was a three-year starter, anchoring the middle of the Aggies line. In 2018, he was a team captain who paved the way for the SEC's leading rusher and in 2019 was the first Saint in franchise history to start at cen-

ter in Week One, opening all 16 contests. McCoy has opened all 60 contests he has appeared in at center and signed a five-year contract extension with the team in 2022.

G/C Cesar Ruiz - The hard-working, talented and intelligent lineman is a perfect fit for New Orleans' culture. He was selected with the 24th pick in the 2020 NFL Draft out of the University of Michigan. The three-year letterman played in 36 games in college, starting his last 31 including the final 26 at center, earning All-Big Ten in 2019. Ruiz settled in at right guard in the last 15 games, with nine starts, as well as both postseason contests. When McCoy suffered a lower leg injury in the first quarter of the 2021 opening win over Green Bay, Ruiz transitioned over to his natural position, where the Saints did not give up a sack in his four starts at center. He returned to right guard on Oct. 25 at Seattle and was the only lineman in 2021 to not miss a start. Ruiz opened 13 games at right guard and one at center in 2022 before suffering a season-ending foot injury Dec. 18, vs. Atlanta. The 46 consecutive starts for Ruiz at the time of his injury was the longest active streak for a Saint. Following an ardent rehab, Ruiz returned to the starting lineup for the season opener on September 10, the day after signing a four-year contract extension.

T Landon Young - A mainstay at left tackle for his entire college career at Kentucky, Young played in 49 contests with 30 starts in his college career. The Lexington, Ky. native was selected by New Orleans in the sixth round of the 2021 NFL Draft and held up to the competition in training camp to snare a roster spot. Young opened one contest at right tackle in 2021 and serves as Ramczyk's backup on the right side, also playing jumbo tight end. In 2022, Young showed versatility. On October 13 at Pittsburgh, he slide over to left tackle for the second half to replace Hurst (concussion) and opened this the November 20 win over the Rams at one of the league's most challenging positions. In the January 1 win at Philadelphia, Young played the final three quarters in place of Ramczyk (hip) and then started the following week's season finale vs. Carolina.

T Trevor Penning- The club's second first round draft choice (19th overall) in 2022 out of Northern Iowa, the 6-7, 322-pound Penning competed with Hurst for the starting left tackle slot in the preseason before suffering a toe injury. The Clear Lake, Iowa native brings athleticism and extensive college experience to the tackle position, where he played in 37 games with 33 starts. Activated for the second half of the season, Penning served as the club's sixth offensive lineman in jumbo packages and started the season finale at left tackle, carrying over in 2023 to start at the position in the first three contests.

#### IN THE NFL

After finishing ranked seventh in 2021, surrendering 318.2 net yards per game, the New Orleans defense returned to the top five again in 2022, ranking fifth, while giving up 314.8 net yards per game. New Orleans and San Francisco are the only two teams to rank in the top ten each of the last three seasons and this marked the third time the Saints have ranked in the top ten in total defense for three straight seasons (1982-84 and 1991-93).

A third round draft pick of the Denver Broncos in 2018 out of Boston College, in addition to starting 21 of his 71 career contests on defense and posting 111 tackles, a split sack, one interception, 17 passes defensed and a forced fumble, **Isaac Yiadom** has recorded 19 career coverage stops for five teams. Brought up to the active roster during Gray's injury, Yiadom brought a boost to the Saints coverage units with two stops, remaining an integral part of the group after Gray's return to the lineup and re-signing in the offseason.

One of the club's two third round draft picks in 2020, **Zack Baun**, a former Wisconsin standout, has embraced work on the team's special teams units. He has recorded 20 tackles on coverage, one blocked field goal and 38 defensive stops. On Sept. 10 at Tennessee, Baun got his hands on a punt that went out of bounds one yard past the line of scrimmage, a game-changing play.

Selected in the second round of the 2019 NFL Draft by the Houston Texans out of Kentucky, DB Lonnie Johnson Jr. provides extensive experience and depth to the Saints defensive and special teams units. In 59 games with 19 starts for the Texans, Tennessee Titans and Saints, Johnson has posted 17 coverage stops, in addition to posting 169 defensive tackles, four interceptions and 14 passes defensed. Johnson has found a significant role on multiple special teams units for New Orleans after signing in the offseason as an unrestricted free agent and ranks among team leaders with two tackles.

## **QUARTERBACKS**

#### **DEREK CARR**

- On March 6, 2023 the New Orleans Saints agreed to terms with QB Derek Carr on a four-year contract to solidify the team's quarterback position, He spent the first nine seasons of his NFL career with the Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders. Originally selected in the second round (36th overall) of the 2014 NFL Draft by the Raiders out of Fresno State, the Bakersfield, Calif. native has started all 145 career regular season games he's played in, completing 3,258-of-5,045 passes (64.6 percent) for 35,858 yards with 219 touchdown passes, 101 interceptions and a 91.6 passer rating, while adding 845 rushing yards and six touchdowns. From 2014-22 as a member of the Raiders, Carr was selected to four Pro Bowl Games (2015-17, 2022) and set numerous team passing records including the franchise's career passing yardage and touchdown pass marks and single-season mark in passing yards (4,804 in 2021). as the only signal-caller in the team's history with multiple seasons reaching the 4,000 yard mark. He also holds franchise records from his Raiders tenure for multipletouchdown pass games (69), contests with a passer rating of at least 100.0 (47) and 300-yard passing performances (33).
- '• Since entering the league in 2014, Carr ranks third in the NFL in completions, fourth in passing yardage and seventh in passing touchdowns. He became the third quarterback in history to pass for 3,000-plus yards in each of his first nine seasons, joining Pro Football Hall of Fame signal-caller Peyton Manning and Russell Wilson. He is just the fourth player in NFL history to reach 35,000 passing yards in his first nine seasons. He has completed 279 passes of 25+ yards since he entered the league in 2014, the fifth-most in the NFL over that span. His 143 starts are the most by a quarterback since 2014.
- Carr enjoyed a successful Saints debut in Sunday's win over Tennessee, when he completed 23-of-33 passes (69.7%) for 305 yards with one touchdown, one interception and a 96.1 passer rating.
- .• Carr helped lead New Orleans to a 20-17 victory at Carolina on Monday Night Football on Sept. 18, when in the second half, he completed a 42-yard pass to Chris Olave and a 45-yard pass to Rashid Shaheed to set up the Saints' two touchdowns.
- .• On Sunday at Green Bay, Carr had completed 13-of-18 (72.2%) of his passes for 103 yards with an eight-yard scoring throw to TE Jimmy Graham and a 104.6 passer rating to help put New Orleans ahead 17-0 over the Packers before being forced to leave in the third quarter with a sprained AC joint injury that puts his status at day-to-day for this week's matchup against Tampa Bay.

- The 2013 Heisman Trophy winner at Florida State and the first pick in the 2015 NFL Draft, Winston has appeared in 87 games with 80 starts, completing 1,748-of-2,851 passes (61.3%) for 21,941 yards with 139 touchdowns, 96 interceptions and an 87.5 rating, adding 1,220 rushing yards and 11 touchdowns. In 2021, before suffering a season-ending knee injury in Week Eight, Winston completed 95-of-161 passes for 1,170 yards, 14 touchdowns, three interceptions and a 102.8 passer rating, ranked first in the NFL at the time of his injury in touchdown percentage (8.7).

A constant participant on special teams from midseason in 2017 to midseason in 2020, as well as the backup signal-caller and as a runner and receiver, in 2018, Hill averaged 24.9 yards per return on 14 kickoff returns, had six coverage stops, second on the team, completed a ten-yard pass on a fake punt and blocked a punt. Overall, Hill carried 37 times for 196 yards (5.3 avg.), third on the team, with two touchdowns and completed three of seven passes for 64 yards. The blocked punt that sparked a division-clinching win at Tampa Bay, earned him Week 14 NFC Special Teams Player of the Week honors. In the postseason, he caught a touchdown, made a special teams tackle and executed a successful fake punt, making significant contributions in all facets as the team advanced to the NFC Championship game for the third time in franchise history.

- In 2019, Hill carried 27 times for 156 yards (5.8 avg.) with a touchdown, catching 19 passes for 234 yards with six TDs, deflecting a punt and posting two coverage stops. He ranked third on the club in touchdowns and third in receiving TDs. After a multi-threat performance Thanksgiving night at Atlanta, when he deflected a punt and caught and rushed for a touchdown. Hill became the first quarterback to rush for and catch a touchdown in the same contest since Jim McMahon (1983). Following Brees' injury, Nov. 15, Hill went 3-1 in four starts.

Overall, he ranked second on the team in rushing with 96 carries for a career-high 575 yards (clubbest 6.0 avg.) with a club-best seven rushing touchdowns, nine catches for 75 yards with two scores, leading the team in total touchdowns, while completing 13-of-19 passes for 240 yards with two touchdown throws and a 146.3 passer rating.

# HILL MOVES THE CHAINS

In the Sept. 18 win at Carolina, Hill's importance to his team was even further accentuated after running back Jamaal Williams suffered a hamstring injury in the second quarter that left only one healthy tailback on the active roster. Hill carried nine times for 75 yards, including gaining a key 11-yard rush on New Orleans' final possession for the first down, allowing the Saints to kneel down for an important 20-17 divisional victory. In addition, he completed his only passing attempt for an eight-yard gain in the contest. Over the past two seasons, Hill has been especially successful moving the chains with his legs with 39 of his

112 rushes going for first downs. The 36.1 rushing first down percentage ranks sixth in the NFL over that time.

#### **JAMAAL WILLIAMS**

- Signed by the Saints as an unrestricted free agent from Detroit in the offseason, Williams is a talented runner who had a breakout season in 2022, as he led the National Football League and set a Lions single-season franchise record for rushing touchdowns with 17. In 17 games with nine starts for Detroit, Williams added on 262 attempts for 1,066 rushing yards and 12 receptions for 73 yards, producing the first 1,000 yard rushing season of his career.
- The former BYU star's talent came consistently all over the field, as well as in short bursts, as ten of his rushing touchdowns in 2022 came from exactly one yard out, tied for third-most in NFL history. A sound ballcarrier, he went 752 career touches before fumbling the ball and became the league's first active running back to reach 600 carries before fumbling.

#### **ALVIN KAMARA**

- A talented runner and receiver with a 5-10, 215-pound frame who was selected by the Saints in the third round of the 2017 NFL Draft out of the University of Tennessee, Kamara enjoyed an outstanding rookie campaign. He ranked first on the club and sixth in the NFL in yards from scrimmage (1,554), second on the team in rushing and receiving, carrying 120 times for 728 yards (6.1 avg.) with eight TDs and a two-point conversion, catching 81 passes for 826 yards (10.2 avg.) with five TDs and a kickoff return for a TD for a club rookie record 14 total scores, tied for second in the NFL. Kamara finished first in the NFL in yards per carry.

In the Saints' 2020 Christmas Day 52-33 win over the Vikings, Kamara tied the NFL record for total touchdowns and rushing touchdowns (6), as he carried 22 times for a career-high 155 yards (7.0 avg.), adding three receptions for 17 yards for 172 yards from scrimmage. The rushing touchdowns record tied the record held by Ernie Nevers of the Chicago Cardinals since Nov. 28, 1929, while for total touchdowns, Kamara joins Nevers, Cleveland's Dub Jones (Nov. 25, 1951) and Chicago's Gayle Sayers (Dec. 12, 1965). # **WIDE RECEIVERS**

#### **CHRIS OLAVE**

· A talented wide receiver who became one of the most prolific receivers in Buckeyes history, Olave played in 47 games and caught 176 passes for 2,711 yards (15.4 avg.) with 35 touchdowns. Olave's 35 career touchdown receptions set an Ohio State program record and ranks fourth in Big Ten history. His 11 career 100-yard games also ranks second in school history. Olave entered the starting lineup in 2019 with immediate results. He helped lead the Buckeyes to three consecutive Big Ten championships (2018-2020) and back-to-back College Football Playoff appearances (2019, 2020). In the 2020 CFP Semifinal vs. Clemson, Olave had a career night, hauling in six passes for 132 yards and two touchdowns in a 49-28 win, securing a bid to play in the championship game. Olave seamlessly integrated into the Saints offense following a standout senior campaign, where he caught 65 passes for 936 yards (14.4 avg.) and 13 touchdowns, tied for sixth nationally, as he was selected as an AFCA first-team All-American and a consensus second-team All-American.

•Following a September, where he captured NFL Offensive Rookie of the Month honors with 17 grabs for a league rookie-best 268 yards, including scoring receiving touchdowns in back to back contests, Olave led the team in receiving, yards per catch and receiving yardage with 72 grabs for 1,042 yards (14.5 avg.) with four touchdowns along with a successful two-point conversion, ranking second among rookies in receiving yardage and tied for second in catches and third down grabs (26). Olave became the first Saints rookie since Danny Abramowicz (1967) to lead the team in receiving, receiving yardage and yards per catch in his first campaign. The receiving yardage total was second all-time among Saints rookies, as he was only the third Black and Gold rookie to reach 1,000.

Chris Olave became the 24th player since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger to record 1,000 receiving yards in his rookie season in 2022, recording 1,042.

## RETURN TO ACTION

After being sidelined for all but three games in 2022 with a toe injury that required surgery, Thomas has had a successful return to the field in 2023, ranking second on the team in receiving with 18 receptions for 166 yards.

## **TIGHT ENDS**

#### **JUWAN JOHNSON**

- The former Penn State and Oregon wideout joined the Saints in 2020 following the NFL Draft and transitioned to tight end his second season. In 2022, the New Jersey native had a breakout campaign as he appeared in 16 games with 12 starts and finished with 42 receptions for 508 yards and a team-best seven touchdown grabs. Johnson's touchdown grab total was tied for third among NFL tight ends.
- Through the first two games of 2023, Johnson leads the Saints tight ends with seven receptions for 61 yards.

#### **FOSTER MOREAU**

- •This veteran tight end and New Orleans native enters his fifth NFL season and first with the Black and Gold after spending his first four seasons with the Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders. In his career, Moreau has appeared in 63 regular season games with 36 starts and has recorded 93 receptions for 1,127 yards (12.1 avg.) with 12 touchdowns and has posted at least 30 catches in each of his last two campaigns. In 2022, the former Jesuit High School and LSU standout set career-highs in receptions (33) and receiving yards (420), while adding two touchdowns.
- •While also serving as an important blocking presence, Moreau got involved in the stat sheet in the Sept. 18 win at Carolina with two receptions for 20 yards.

#### **JIMMY GRAHAM**

• New Orleans' third round draft choice in 2010 after playing four years of basketball and just one year of football at the University of Miami (Fla.). Graham broke out in his second year with the Saints totaling 99 catches for 1,310 yards with 11 touchdowns and went on to lead the team in receiving for four consecutive seasons. Graham's production has been among the top 10 in NFL history at the tight end position in all three major categories: receptions, yards, and receiving touchdowns. Graham posts career totals of 714 receptions, 8,514 yards, and 86 touchdowns. His 86 receiving touchdowns rank 4<sup>th</sup> all time among NFL tight ends,

while his 52 touchdowns as a Saint rank 2<sup>nd</sup> in franchise history. He and Kansas City's Travis Kelce are the only two tight ends in NFL history to have multiple seasons of 1,200-plus receiving yards and 10- plus receiving touchdowns. Graham returns to New Orleans, the location of his most personal and team success, after playing in seven campaigns with three other teams.

## RECEIVING LEADER

Saints TE Jimmy Graham's 86 career touchdown receptions rank fourth among tight ends all-time, his 714 receptions seventh and his 8,514 receiving yards eighth.

•New Orleans' first choice in the 2011 NFL Draft (24th overall) out of California, Jordan enjoyed another standout season in 2022, recording 66 tackles, a club-best 8.5 sacks for a loss of 67.5 yards, a team-high 12 stops for loss and 14 quarterback hits, two passes defensed and two forced fumbles to tie for the team lead.

#### RECORD-BREAKER

Jordan is now ranked first on the club's all-time sack list (116) and 23rd on the NFL's list. He has headlined the only defense in the NFL to rank both in the top three in opponent rushing yards per game and sacks over the past seven seasons.

## **MULTI-SACK GAMES**

Jordan has posted 115.5 career sacks and is the only player to have 90 takedowns and 50 passes defensed. During this time, the Saints own a 57-23 regular season record when he corrals a signal-caller, and they boast a 24-3 mark in a multi-sack performance in the regular season, including a three-sack performance on Jan. 1 at Philadelphia that made him the franchise's all-time leader in sacks, the same opponent of his first three-sack performance in 2012. With the three-takedown performance against the Eagles, Jordan's 27 multi-sack games are tied for first in franchise record books with Pro Football Hall of Fame linebacker Rickey Jackson's 27, with both of them leading the franchise with six performances of at least three sacks.

#### **DEMARIO DAVIS**

• This dependable and sure-tackling defender joined the New Orleans Saints in 2018 after spending his first six National Football League seasons with the New York Jets and Cleveland Browns. For his career, the Brandon, Miss. native has appeared in 180 career regular season games with 166 starts for the Jets (2012-15, 2017), Cleveland (2016) and the Saints (2018-), recording 1,234 stops (800 solo), 37 sacks, three interceptions, 51 passes defensed, three forced fumbles, seven fumble recoveries and 24 special teams tackles. With a club-best seven stops on Jan. 1, 2023 at Philadelphia, Davis joined Bobby Wagner and Lavonte David as only the third active NFL player with 1,200 stops.

•In 2018, Davis opened all 16 contests and led the team with 110 stops (74 solo), five sacks to lead the linebackers, four passes defensed, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. Davis' abilities to diagnose and tackle played a key role in New Orleans ranking second in the NFL in opponent rushing yards per game and opponent rushing yards per play. Participating in the postseason for the first time, Davis led the defense with 22 stops (15 solo), an interception in the NFC Championship and a pass defense. ### **IRON MAN**

Davis who had never missed a game in his career until December 27, 2021 vs. Miami due to COVID-19 protocols, ranks as one of the league's most durable defenders, while playing one of the game's most physically demanding positions. His 158 consecutive games played streak was the longest in the NFL by a position player and his 79 straight games started were the most at his position. In 2022, Davis was one of three Black and Gold starting defenders to open every contest, joining safety Tyrann Mathieu and defensive tackle David Onyemata. More impressive, he was the only linebacker in the NFL to play in every defensive snap for his teams.

Werner helped power the Buckeyes to the College Football Playoff championship game as a senior in 2020, when he was voted by Big Ten coaches as a first-team All-Conference selection and a Butkus Award semifinalist, posting 54 tackles, 2.5 stops for loss, one sack and two forced fumbles. Werner made his second career start Oct. 3 vs. the Giants and recorded a ten tackles. With 13 stops in Week Five at Washington, he became the first Saints rookie defender to reach double-digit totals in back-to-back games. He ranked fifth on the team with 59 tackles.
- Werner enjoyed a standout 2022 season, appearing in 12 games with 11 starts at weakside linebacker and ranked third on the team and second at the linebacker position, despite missing five games, with 79 tackles (55 solo), three stop for loss, three passes defensed, two forced fumbles and one special teams tackle.
- Werner got off to an impressive start for the 2023 season, finishing second on the team with eight stops in the Sept. 10 season-opening win over Tennessee, one stop for loss and a split sack, his first career takedown. Leading the team in stops in the last two contests, Werner has 26 stops, a split sack and one quarterback hit for the season from the weakside position.

## **SECONDARY**

#### **S TYRANN MATHIEU**

 This versatile, hard-hitting, playmaking safety and New Orleans native returned home, signing after the draft and brings extensive experience to the secondary. Mathieu was selected by the Arizona Cardinals in the third round (69th overall) in the 2013 NFL Draft out of LSU and has played for the Cardinals (2013-17), Houston Texans (2018), Kansas City Chiefs (2019-21) and now the Saints. In 11 NFL seasons, he has played in 149 regular season games with 140 starts and has posted career totals of 710 tackles (590 solo), 42 stops for loss, ten sacks for a loss of 78 yards, 29 interceptions for 379 returns yards, three brought back for touchdowns, 91 passes defensed, four forced fumbles, seven fumble recoveries and five special teams stops. Mathieu has been selected to three Pro Bowls, three Associated Press All-Pro teams and the Pro Football Hall of Fame's 2010's All-Decade Team.

### NOSE FOR THE BALL

Mathieu came to New Orleans after starting all 16 games he played in for Kansas City in 2021 and recording 76 tackles, one sack, a career-high three fumble recoveries, one sack and two interceptions to earn his second consecutive Pro Bowl selection. With a team-leading three picks and one fumble recovery, adding up to a team-best four takeaways to go with a career-high 91 tackles (club-best 64 solo) to rank third on the team and first in the secondary.

Mathieu's 29 picks since coming into the league in 2013 are ranked fourth in the NFL. 2022 marked the fourth consecutive season that he led the team he played for in picks.

#### **CB MARSHON LATTIMORE**

.•Selected by the Saints in the first round (11<sup>th</sup> overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft, Lattimore started all 13 games he appeared in. He totaled 53 tackles (44 solo), a forced fumble, one fumble recovery, five interceptions for 85 yards and 18 passes defensed, as he became the youngest Saint (21 years old) ever selected to the Pro Bowl and was selected as the *AP* NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year.

• In 2018, Lattimore opened all 16 contests and posted a career-high 59 tackles (49 solo), two interceptions, 12 passes defensed, a club-best four forced fumbles (tied for fourth in the NFL) and three fumble recoveries returned for 91 yards, leading the team in takeaways and tied for the NFL lead in defensive fumble recoveries, the highest total among defensive backs.

 A standout 2019 campaign by Lattimore resulted in him being voted to the Pro Bowl, the only Saints cornerback to ever be selected multiple times. Lattimore started all 14 games he played in and posted 57 stops, one interception and ranked first on the team with 14 passes defensed.

.• In 2020, he posted a career-high 62 tackles (52 solo), two interceptions and 11 passes defensed as he was voted to the Pro Bowl for the third time.

- .• After signing a contract extension in 2021, Lattimore continued to fulfill high expectations as he posted 68 stops, three picks, a career-high 19 passes defensed, ranked third in the NFL and one fumble recovery, being selected to his fourth Pro Bowl.
- .• After missing ten games (abdomen) in 2022, Lattimore returned to action Jan. 1, 2023 at Philadelphia and made an instant impact, tying for the team lead with six solo tackles, a team-high two passes defensed and returning an interception 12 yards for a touchdown for New Orleans' first defensive score of the season. He started all seven games he appeared in and posted 21 stops, the pick for a score and four passes defensed.
- .• To open 2023, Lattimore came up with a standout performance in the season-opening win over Tennessee. In addition to his 15th career pick, to move him into a tie for eighth place in club record books in interceptions, he also had four passes defensed, the third time in his career, he has deflected at least four throws in a contest.

## **GET A HAND UP**

Lattimore's 84 passes defensed since entering the NFL in 2017 are the most by a Saint and ranked third in the league despite missing ten games in 2022.

#### **CB PAULSON ADEBO**

- New Orleans' third round selection (76th overall) in the 2021 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Adebo overcame not playing college football in 2020 to make significant contributions to the Saints secondary in his first season with the club.
   The Texas native finished his college career playing in 22 games with 21 starts for Stanford and recording 97 tackles, 34 passes defensed and eight interceptions, earning All-Pac 12 honors in both 2018 and 2019.
- Adebo showed his development by opening opposite Lattimore in the 2021 regular season opening win vs. Green Bay and returning a pick 33 yards in the third quarter to become the first Saints defender to have an interception in his NFL debut since LB James Allen vs. Tampa Bay on September 8, 2002. He then added a second pick in the Week Five win at Washington. With a pick in the regular season finale at Atlanta, Adebo finished his rookie campaign ranked fifth on the club with 63 tackles (54 solo), tied for first with three picks and added eight passes defensed and two special teams stops.

- Adebo fought off injuries and played in 13 games with 12 starts to lead the team's corners with 60 tackles (51 solo) and added seven passes defensed for the NFL's second-ranked club in opponent passing yards per game.
- •Sharpened by an extensive training camp competition, Adebo recorded his first interception since his rookie year in the season-opening win over Tennessee and a fumble recovery in Monday night's win at Carolina.

#### **CB ALONTAE TAYLOR**

- .•Selected by the Saints in the second round (49<sup>th</sup> overall) of the 2022 NFL Draft out of Tennessee, Taylor shook off early injuries to play in 13 games with nine starts and posted 45 tackles (38 solo) and a club-best 11 passes defensed.
- Moving to the nickel position in 2023, has 15 tackles and an NFL-best seven passes defensed playing in the nickel.

Taylor's pass defense total was ranked fourth among NFL rookies.

## WHAT TO LOOK FOR

- If the Saints defeat the Buccaneers, they would improve their regular season record in the series to 40-24 and the Buccaneers would join Atlanta as the second franchise to have 40 victories against.
- In addition to improving their record on the season to 3-1, New Orleans would start 2-0 at home for the first time since 2019 and start 2-0 in the NFC South for the first time since 2020.
- A Saints victory would improve their all-time regular season home record to 218-217-1
- New Orleans has given up 20 or fewer points in a franchise record 11 consecutive games dating back to the 2022 season, looking to extend that streak to 12 on Sunday.
- New Orleans has given up 18 or fewer points in a franchise record nine consecutive games dating back to the 2022 season, looking to extend that streak to double-digits as well.
- QB Derek Carr has 3,258 career completions, ranked 25th all-time, needing 39 completions to tie Dan Fouts for 24th and 40 to surpass him.
- Carr has 219 career touchdown passes, ranked 37th alltime, needing four to tie Ryan Fitzpatrick for 26th and five to surpass him.
- LB Demario Davis has 1,234 career tackles, needing 16 to reach 1,250 for his career.
- TE Jimmy Graham has 8,514 career receiving yards, ranked 92nd all-time. With 51 receiving yards, he would tie Pro Football Hall of Fame WR Paul Warfield for 91st and with 52 would surpass Warfield.
- With 86 career touchdown receptions, Graham is ranked 17th all-time. With one touchdown reception, he would move into a tie for 16th with Pro Football Hall of Fame WR Andre Reed and with two, he would surpass Reed and move into a tie for 15th with Don Maynard.
- DE Cameron Jordan's 27 multi-sack games are tied for

first in franchise record books with Pro Football Hall of Fame LB Rickey Jackson, needing one more to become the franchise's all-time leader. With his six three-sack games, that is tied for first in club history with Jackson, needing one more to become the leader in that category.

- Jordan will play in his 196th career regular season game on Sunday, surpassing Jackson for the lead in most contests played by a Saints defender and putting him in a tie for second in club record books with Pro Football Hall of Fame K Morten Andersen.
- Jordan needs eight tackles to reach 750 for his career.
- RB Alvin Kamara has 72 career touchdowns, tied for first in franchise history with WR Marques Colston. With his next touchdown, Kamara would become the franchise's all-time leader.
- Kamara's 49 career rushing touchdowns are tied with RB Deuce McAllister for second in club record books. With one rushing touchdown, he would surpass McAllister and join RB Mark Ingram II as the second Saint with 50 rushing touchdowns, with two, would tie Ingram for first in club record books and with three would become the franchise's new recordholder in the category.
- Kamara's four career two point conversions are tied with Ingram for first in club record books, needing one more to become the club's all-time leader.
- Kamara's 3,753 career receiving yards rank 11th in club record books. With six receiving yards, he would move into the top 10 past WR Quinn Early and with 97, he would surpass TE Hoby Brenner for ninth.
- CB Marshon Lattimore's 15 career receptions are tied for eighth in club record books with Brett Maxie, Marcus Williams and Ernie Jackson. With one interception, he would move into a tie for seventh with CB Toi Cook and with two, he would move into a tie for sixth with CB Johnnie Poe.
- S Tyrann Mathieu will play in his 150th career NFL game on Sunday. With 592 career solo tackles, Mathieu needs eight to reach 600 for his career.
- After recording 104 receiving yards on Sunday at Green Bay, with 100 receiving yards on Sunday vs. Tampa Bay, WR Chris Olave would achieve the feat for the first time in his career and would be the first Saint to have 100 yards receiving in consecutive contests since WR Michael Thomas did so in three straight games from 12/8-12/22/19.
- Long snapper Zach Wood will play in his 102nd career game on Sunday, moving him into a tie with DL Bruce Clark, LS Justin Drescher, WR Joe Horn and RB Wayne Wilson for 51st on the club's games played list.
