THE MATCHUP

The New Orleans Saints (1-1) and New York Jets (1-1) will face off in Week 3 of the NFL preseason when they meet at MetLife Stadium on Saturday, Aug. 24 at 6:30 p.m. CT.

The Saints enter this week's competition with a 1-1 pre-season record after returning early Monday morning from Los Angeles with a 19-17 road victory over the Los Angeles Chargers on Aug. 18 following two days of joint practice between the two clubs. New Orleans evened their record after dropping a 34-25 decision in the Mercedes-Benz Superdome on Aug. 9 in their 2019 preseason opener.

New Orleans and New York have met in eight previous preseason contests with the clubs deadlocked at 4-4 record and the Saints leading the regular season series 7-6. New Orleans is riding a three-game winning streak in the preseason against the Jets, having not dropped a preseason tilt against Saturday night's opponent since 2000 and taking command of the regular season series with a 31-19 win at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome on Dec. 17, 2017.

In a nationally televised contest, the Black and Gold rallied in dramatic fashion to beat the Chargers in Sunday afternoon's preseason game in Carson, Calif., erasing a 17-3 halftime deficit with two second half touchdowns and a field goal with 1:05 remaining.

Backup quarterback **Taysom Hill** threw TD passes of 27-yards to wide receiver **Austin Carr** in the third quarter and for one-yard to rookie running back **Devine Ozigbo** in the fourth quarter. With a two-point conversion attempt unsuccessful, New Orleans trailed 17-16 with 6:46 left in the contest.

After New Orleans forced a punt quickly on Los Angeles' ensuing possession, Hill engineered a nine-play, 50-yard drive, where he completed two-of-two passes for 24-yards and converted a first down with a six-yard rush to set up a 28-yard field goal by kicker **Wil Lutz** with 1:05 remaining. Linebacker **Colton Jumper** recorded and interception with 32 seconds left to clinch the victory.

Long before the comeback, the majority of the Saints' no. 1 offense played to mixed results behind **Teddy Bridgewater** at quarterback.

The Saints defense surrendered 304 total net yards to the Chargers, but what really impressed was surrendering only one defensive touchdown in the contest and interceptions by Jumper and linebacker **A.J. Klein**.

New Orleans' linebackers shined in the contest, both in coverage and run-stopping. In addition to the picks by Jumper and Klein, rookie **Kaden Elliss** and **Darnell Sankey** tied for the team lead with six tackles apiece, while **Demario Davis** wasn't far behind with five stops.

Following Lutz's game-winning kick late in the contest, the fourth-year placekicker and kickoff man is in midseason form, having drilled all six field goal attempts in the preseason.

Undrafted rookie wide receiver/return specialist **Deonte Harris**, the NCAA's all-time leader in combined kickoff/punt return touchdowns (14) at Division II Assumption (Mass.) College continues to make a spirited competition for return duties for the club. Harris brought back five punts for 55 yards, including a 26-yard runback and also returned two kickoffs for 50 yards.

THE COACHES

New Orleans Saints Head Coach **Sean Payton** has posted a 126-80 overall record (.612), including an 8-6 postseason mark after the franchise had won only one playoff game prior to his arrival. Payton holds both the club's top win total and winning percentage. He continues to represent the Saints as the model of stability not only within the NFC South, as he is the longest tenured head coach within the division, but also among the most accomplished within the National Football League. Only the New England Patriots' Bill Belichick (2000) has been with the his team longer than Payton's 13 seasons. Payton is also one of just seven active NFL head coaches to lead a team to a Super Bowl victory. The others are Belichick, the Seattle Seahawks' Pete Carroll, the Oakland Raiders' Jon Gruden (Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2002), the Baltimore Ravens' John Harbaugh, the Philadelphia Eagles' Doug Pederson and the Pittsburgh Steelers' Mike Tomlin. The 2018 Saints edition posted a 13-3 regular season record, secured the NFC's number one seed for the postseason and advanced to the NFC Championship game. A franchise-record five players were selected to the *Associated Press* All-Pro team and a club-best eight were named to the Pro Bowl. New Orleans' ten-game winning streak was the second-longest in club history and the longest run of consecutive victories in the NFL in 2019. The streak only sits behind in club record books, New Orleans' 13-0 start under Payton in 2009, the season when they captured Super Bowl XLIV. Payton earned a bachelor's degree in communications at Eastern Illinois, where as a quarterback he had 10,665 passing yards, at the time the third-highest total in NCAA Division I-AA history. Payton was inducted into the Eastern Illinois Hall of Fame in September of 2000 and had his jersey retired in a ceremony in September of 2010. He received an honorary doctorate from his alma mater in 2013. Payton was born December 29, 1963 in San Mateo, Calif., and raised in Naperville, Ill., Payton has a daughter, Meghan and a son, Connor.

Adam Gase became the 17th head coach in New York Jets history on January 11, 2019. Gase enters his 17th NFL season with a long-standing resume of quarterback success with signal-callers such as Peyton Manning, Jay Cutler, and Ryan Tannehill all studying under Gase. Prior to joining the Jets, Gase spent the last three seasons as head coach of the Miami Dolphins, where he compiled a 23-25 record and led the franchise to their first postseason berth since 2008 in his first season. Gase was only the fourth head coach in Dolphins history to advance to the postseason in his first season in charge of the fish. Gase joined Miami after serving as the offensive coordinator of the Chicago Bears in 2015. In his lone season in charge of the Bears offense, Gase helped improve the team's rushing

attach from 27th in the National Football League to 11th. He also helped Cutler post the highest quarterback rating (92.3) of his career. Prior to coming to Chicago, Gase spent six seasons (2009-14) with the Denver Broncos. In Gase's first season as offensive coordinator (2013), the Broncos set NFL records in both points (606) and touchdowns (76). He began his NFL career as a scouting assistant for the Detroit Lions (2003-04) and served as an assistant coach with the Lions (2005-07) and San Francisco 49ers (2008). Gase earned his bachelor's degree from Michigan State, where he was a student assistant. He was a graduate/recruiting assistant at Louisiana State (2000-03) under former Tigers Head Coach Nick Saban, who he followed from Lansing.

SERIES HISTORY

The Saints and Jets have met 13 times, with New Orleans leading New York 7-6. The preseason series is tied at 4-4.

Two of New Orleans' regular season victories against the Jets have come as shutouts, with the Saints posting 14 shutouts in their 51-year history. Overall, this series has been extremely close with eight of the 11 contests being decided by seven points or less, five by three points or less.

LAST REGULAR SEASON MEETING

Saints 31, New York Jets 19; December 17, 2017 @ Mercedes Benz Superdome – Mark Ingram gave the Saints much more than the first-down run they needed to wind down the clock on the Jets.

His determined burst across the line of scrimmage thrust him into New York's defensive backfield with too much speed and vigor for anyone to catch him — a fitting finish to one of his better days in a memorable season.

Ingram ran for two touchdowns and gained 151 yards from scrimmage, capped by his late 50-yard TD run, and New Orleans overcame three turnovers to defeat the reeling Jets 31-19 on Sunday.

"Getting the ball into his hands is obviously what we want to do," Saints center Max Unger said of Ingram, who has eclipsed 1,000 yards rushing for a second straight season. "We've got to get him going because when he has a chance to make plays like that — you can see it — he's explosive."

Ingram's 54-yard gain on a screen, which set up a field goal, was the longer of his two 50-yard plays.

"He's making people miss. He's creating," said fellow running back Alvin Kamara, who added a 10-yard touchdown catch.

The Saints (10-4) needed to beat the Jets (5-9) to maintain a tenuous hold on first place in the NFC South. New Orleans leads Carolina (10-4) on head-to-head results. Atlanta (8-5) can pull one game behind by beating Tampa Bay on Monday night.

The Jets, who were eliminated from the playoffs, kept it close until Saints receiver Michael Thomas' fourth-quarter touchdown on a four-yard slant made it 24-13.

Bryce Petty made his first start at quarterback for New York this season, completing 19 of 39 passes for 179 yards and a touchdown. He was intercepted twice — once by Craig Robertson on a tipped pass and once by Marshon Lattimore on a long, inconsequential throw as the game ended.

Petty's two-yard touchdown pass to running back Elijah McGuire cut New Orleans' lead to 24-19 with 1:51 left. But the Jets' onside kick failed.

Drew Brees completed 26 of 36 passes for 285 yards and two touchdowns, but also was intercepted deep in New Orleans territory to set up a Jets field goal at the end of the first half.

Carter played for Allen in Oakland in 2012 when he served as Raiders head coach, having Jets Offensive Line Coach **Frank Pollack** and defensive assistant **Eric Sanders** on his staff. TEAM NOTES

FAMILY TIES

Numerous Saints players, coaches and administrators are not the only members of their families to make a name for themselves in pro football. No fewer than 20 Saints players, coaches or front office personnel have relatives who have played, coached or served in the front office in the NFL.

Defensive Coordinator Dennis Allen - Father, Grady, played linebacker for the Atlanta Falcons from 1968-72.

Offensive Coordinator Pete Carmichael - Father, Pete, served as an assistant coach in the NFL from 1994-2003 with the Jacksonville Jaguars and the Chicago Bears.

Quarterbacks Coach Joe Lombardi - The grandson of legendary NFL head coach Vince Lombardi, who led both the Green Bay Packers and Washington Redskins. He led the Packers to three straight and five overall NFL Championships in seven years, in addition to winning the first two Super Bowls.

Secondary Coach Aaron Glenn - Younger brother, Jason, was a linebacker and sixth-round draft pick of the Detroit Lions in the 2001 NFL Draft, playing six seasons in the NFL with the Jets, Dolphins and Vikings.

Linebackers Coach Mike Nolan - Father, Dick, played safety in the NFL for nine years before becoming a coach. He led the San Francisco 49ers from 1968 to 1975 and was the head coach of the Saints from 1978 to 1980.

Offensive Assistant D.J. Williams - Father, Doug Williams, is Washington's senior vice president of player personnel, who won Super Bowl XXII as the starting quarterback for the Redskins, the pinnacle of a storied 12-year professional football career.

Asst. GM/College Scouting Dir. Jeff Ireland - Stepson of Chiefs Hall of Fame LB/C E.J. Holub and the grandson of former Eagles RB and Bears personnel exec. Jim Parmer.

National Scout Terry Wooden - Brother, JoJo, is Director of Player Personnel for the Los Angeles Chargers.

DB Ken Crawley - Cousin, Stephon Morris, spent the 2012 season with the New England Patriots

TE A.J. Derby - Father, John, played LB for Detroit in 1992...Uncle, Glenn Derby, was an eighth-round pick (218th overall) by New Orleans in the 1988 NFL draft and played seven games as an offensive lineman from 1989-90.

WR Travin Dural - Cousin of former LSU and NFL RB Dominick Davis and Louisiana-Lafayette and NFL OL Anthony Clement.

DE Mario Edwards Jr. - Father, Mario Edwards Sr., played five NFL seasons at cornerback for the Dallas Cowboys (2000-03) and Tampa Bay Buccaneers (2004).

LB Kaden Ellis - Father, Luther, was a 12-year NFL veteran for Detroit and Denver, who was a two-time Pro Bowl selection for Detroit.

DE Cameron Jordan - Father, Steve, had a 13-year career as a tight end with the Minnesota Vikings, with six Pro Bowl selections.

T/G Marshall Newhouse - Cousin, the late Robert Newhouse, played fullback for the Dallas Cowboys.

WR Michael Thomas - Uncle, Keyshawn Johnson, is a former wide receiver, spending 11 seasons in the NFL with the Jets, Buccaneers, Cowboys and Panthers, earning three Pro Bowls and the Super Bowl XXXVII title.

Area Scout Scott Campbell - Father, Marion was former head coach of the Atlanta Falcons.

Scouting Assistant Matt Phillips - Father, Ted is the president/CEO of the Chicago Bears.

Of the 89 players, 45 have less than four years of previous NFL experience, including 17 players who are in their first NFL training camp. Saints players come from 28 different states, Washington D.C. and Nigeria. Of the 90 players currently on the team's

roster, the state which claims the most members of the team is Texas with 11.

POSITION BY POSITION

QUARTERBACKS (3) - Returners: Drew Brees, Teddy Bridgewater, Taysom Hill. **WORTH NOTING:** Brees enjoyed another prolific season in 2018 en route to his 12th Pro Bowl selection, 11th as a Saint. He completed 364-of-489 passes (NFL-record 74.4%) for 3,992 yards with 32 touchdowns and a career-high and NFL-best 115.7 passer rating, as he became the NFL's all-time completions and passing yardage leader. Bridgewater and Hill are competing in training camp for snaps behind Brees. Bridgewater, a five-year NFL veteran, has appeared in 35 career games with 29 starts and returns to New Orleans for the second consecutive season after he served as Brees' backup in 2018 and started the regular season finale. Now in his third NFL season, in addition to his quarterback duties, Hill has evolved into a threat in other facets of the offense and on special teams. His role expanded further in both phases in 2018, as he played in all 16 games and carried 37 times for 196 yards with two touchdowns, caught five passes, completed three-of-seven throws for 64 yards, returned 14 kickoffs for 348 yards (24.9 avg.), posted six special teams stops and blocked a punt.

RUNNING BACKS (9) - Returners: TB Alvin Kamara, FB Zach Line, TB Alvin Kamara, Dwayne Washington. **Veteran additions:** FB Michael Burton (UFA-Chi.), TB Latavius Murray (UFA-Min.), TB Jacquizz Rodgers (UFA-TB), FB Shane Smith (FA), TB Kerwynn Williams (FA), . **Undrafted rookies:** TB Devine Ozigbo. **Departures from 2018:** TB Mark Ingram. **WORTH NOTING:** A point of emphasis in training camp for New Orleans is to continue to maintain and improve a running game that averaged 126.6 yards per game to rank sixth in the NFL, while retaining its strength as a pass-catching unit. The Saints running attack is led by the duo of Kamara and Murray. Kamara, who recorded 194 carries for 883 yards and a franchise-record 14 touchdowns to lead the team in rushing, was also a threat in the passing game with 81 grabs for 709 yards and four touchdowns, as he led the team with 1,592 total yards from scrimmage and was selected to his second Pro Bowl. Following the departure of Ingram in free agency, New Orleans signed Murray, who carried 140 times for 578 yards (4.1 avg.) with six touchdowns in his final season in Minnesota. Washington handled lead back duties in the regular season finale and rushed for 108 yards. Line is a 6-3, 233 pound bruising blocker who returns for his third season. He excelled in short yardage situations, carrying nine times for 41 yards (4.6 avg.) and catching two touchdowns. **CONTINUED ON NEXT PAGE**

The group is once again led by fourth-year veteran Thomas. In 2018, he led the league in receiving with a franchise-record 125 receptions for 1,405 yards with nine touchdowns and signed a long-term contract extension in the offseason. Ginn returns for his third year with the Black and Gold, healthy after missing the bulk of last season with a knee injury. His ability to stretch the field will serve the Saints well. Smith enjoyed an impressive rookie season, posting 28 receptions for 427 yards (15.3 avg.) and five touchdowns. Kirkwood showed flashes of brilliance as a rookie in the second half of the season, grabbing 16 passes for 185 yards and two touchdowns in the regular season and adding another postseason scoring catch. After missing 2018 with a season-ending knee injury in training camp, Dural will look to compete for a roster spot. Butler has been a surprisingly reliable option in the passing game in training camp as he fights for a roster spot. Carr caught a 27-yard touchdown from quarterback Taysom Hill in the third quarter of Sunday's win at the Los Angeles Chargers and has a solid feel for the club's offense. He will continue to work to show his ability to get open in the preseason, as he Smith, Dural, Cobbs, Kirkwood and Carr compete for spots in the club's multiple receiver sets.

Cook, signed in the offseason as an unrestricted free agent from Oakland as he has played in 149 career regular season games and has compiled 425 receptions for 5,464 yards and 25 touchdowns. The ten-year NFL veteran posted career-highs in receiving (68), receiving yardage (896) and receiving touchdowns as he was selected to his first Pro Bowl. Hill, a six-year National Football League veteran who originally signed with the Saints as an undrafted free agent in 2013, will serve as a solid complement to Cook, recording 16 receptions for 185 yards and one touchdown in 2018. Overall in his career, he has

posted 83 grabs for 799 yards and 11 touchdowns. Mack comes to New Orleans as a rookie from Notre Dame and will compete for both snaps and a roster spot along with Griffin and Arnold, who made significant development in 2018 and Derby, a four-year veteran who was picked up in camp.

McCoy was the club's second round draft pick this spring and a three-year starter at Texas A&M. His career takedown total (71.5), is ranked fourth in club record books. Brown, a stout run stopper will be a welcome addition from New England, where was part of two Super Bowl champion teams to add to a rush defense that ranked second in the NFL in 2018. In his first season, Davenport posted 4.5 sacks and moves into the starting lineup in 2019. Rankins broke out and posted a career-high eight sacks in 2018 and his return will be welcomed after recovery from an Achilles injury. Onyemata posted 4.5 takedowns in 2018. Edwards, an unrestricted free agent acquisition, has the ability to play on the inside or outside. Both Hendrickson and Stallworth are young defensive linemen that serve a key role in the rotation and have the ability to both stop the run and rush the passer. Horton, Williams, Grissom, Kaufusi and Tuttle will compete for roster spots in the preseason contests.

LINEBACKERS (11) - Returners: Darnell Sankey, Alex Anzalone, Craig Robertson, A.J. WORTH NOTING: On the outside, unrestricted free agent acquisition Demario Davis was voted a team captain his first season with the club and made an immediate impact, opening all 16 games and posting a team-high 110 tackles, five sacks, four passes defended, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. Davis also enjoyed an outstanding postseason, leading the team with 22 stops and adding an interception in the NFC Championship game.

Opposite Davis, Klein appeared in all 16 games and posted 70 tackles (42 solo) with two sacks, one interception, three passes defended and a career-high two fumble recoveries. Anzalone and Robertson anchor the middle of the linebacker corps for New Orleans. Robertson, voted a team captain for the second time in 2018, has posted 532 stops for New Orleans and Cleveland in seven NFL campaigns and also is an asset on special teams where he has posted 42 stops, one fumble recovery and has recovered a blocked punt. Anzalone shook off an injury-marred 2017 rookie campaign and recorded a career-high 59 tackles with two sacks, one interception, two passes defended and a club-best three forced fumbles. In addition to serving as backups, Biegel and Robertson also are two of the best special teams coverage players on the club. In 2013, Hummer tied a career-high with 24 tackles, while adding nine special teams stops. Competition also features several rookies and veterans. Martin, signed at the start of training camp, is a seasoned veteran with 62 career defensive tackles and 43 career special teams stops with several clubs.

WORTH NOTING: A mix of veteran experience and youth at the cornerback position will be led by third-year NFL veteran and 2017 *Associated Press* NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year Marshon Lattimore. In his second NFL season, Lattimore finished with 59 tackles (49 solo) and led the team with five takeaways (two interceptions and team-high and club-best three fumble recoveries and 13 passes defended, adding two more picks in the NFC Divisional Playoff win. Lattimore's coverage abilities and emerging veteran leadership will be an asset to the secondary. Patrick Robinson, the club's first round draft pick in 2010, will return to the secondary following his recovery from season-ending ankle surgery following an injury in week three. Brought back to New Orleans in 2018, Robinson manned the nickel for the 2017 Super Bowl Champion Eagles, with him returning an interception for a touchdown in the NFC Championship. The hard-hitting Bell, the club's second round draft pick in 2016, enjoyed a standout third campaign. He led the secondary with 87 tackles (61 solo), one one sack, three passes defended, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery. Williams finished the season with two picks and will look for more big-play opportunities in 2019.

SPECIALISTS (4) - Returners: LS Zach Wood, K Wil Lutz, P Thomas Morstead. **Draft choices/Undrafted rookies:** LS Nick Moore (FA). **WORTH NOTING:** The specialist group remains intact for the third consecutive season. Lutz, is a three-year NFL veteran, who drilled 28-of-30 (93.3%) field goal attempts and 136 points. In his career, Lutz ranks had a 36-game streak of kicking a field goal, second in NFL record books end in the regular season finale. In his career, he has hit 87.0% (87-of-100) of his field goal attempts. Since being picked up at the start of the 2017 season, Wood has handled long-snapping duties flawlessly. Morstead has been a weapon in the field position game with his strong leg and outstanding placement abilities. In ten seasons, he has a 46.9 gross average on 570 punts with a 41.4 net, his net ranking second-all-time in NFL record books. He's coming off another standout season where he recorded a 46.4 gross punting average and a 43.2 net average, which led the NFL. Return duties will feature a competition between Taysom Hill, Austin Carr, Marcus Sherels and Alvin Kamara. Hill posted a 24.9 kickoff return average for New Orleans in 2018. Sherels comes to New Orleans with a career punt return average of 10.6 with five touchdowns in eight seasons in Minnesota. Last season, he averaged 12.0 yards per return and broke a 70-yard runback.

GAME SUMMARIES

WEEK 1: Minnesota Vikings 34, Saints 25; August 9, 2019 @ Mercedes-Benz Superdome – The New Orleans Saints fell behind early in their preseason opener as the Minnesota Vikings jumped out to a 14-6 lead. Led by sixth year veteran **QB Teddy Bridgewater**, the Saints closed the gap just before halftime after Bridgewater hit second-year TE **Dan Arnold** for an 18-yard touchdown pass. The strike to Arnold capped off a six-play 79-yard drive to bring the score to 14-12.

However, the Vikings defense took the momentum

right back on the next series after QB **Taysom Hill's** pass was mishandled by Dan Arnold and intercepted by rookie LB **Nate Meadors** who returned it for a 30-yard touchdown.

On the ensuing offensive possession for Minnesota, QB **Kyle Sloter** hit FB **Khari Blasingame** on two-yard touchdown pass to strengthen the Vikings grip on the game. The 6-play 72-yard drive gave the Vikings a 27-15 lead.

Hill was able to bounce back from the early turnover and lead the team in rushing with 45 yards on six carries while also completing 8-of-14 passes for 80 yards and a touchdown. New Orleans was able to once again close the gap when Hill threw a 33-yard touchdown pass to rookie WR **Lil'Jordan Humphrey** to cut the Vikings' lead to 27-25.

However, on Minnesota's next possession, second year RB **Mike Boone** put the game away by sprinting for a 64-yard rushing touchdown to put Minnesota ahead by nine points and end the Saints' comeback hopes.

WEEK 2: New Orleans Saints 19, Los Angeles Chargers 17; August 18, 2019 @ Dignity Sports Health Center – New Orleans got off to a slow start offensively for the second week in a row, this time on the road visiting the Chargers. QB Teddy Bridgewater started the game, but the Saints offense only produced three points in the first half. Despite turning the ball over twice in the first half, New Orleans' defense forced a turnover of their own when LB **A.J. Klein** intercepted Chargers QB **Tyrod Taylor** and New Orleans maintained a 3-0 lead midway through the second quarter.

The Charger offense got into the end zone when QB **Cardell Jones** threw a 24-yard touchdown pass to rookie WR **Andre Patton** to finish off a 10-play, 98-yard drive and put the Chargers up 7-3. Los Angeles added a field goal and forced the Saints to punt in the final seconds of the first half. The Chargers special teams unit added seven more points to the scoreboard when second year RB **Troyaine Pope** returned the punt 81 yards to put Los Angeles up 11 at halftime.

Trailing 14-3, New Orleans' offense found the end zone for the first time when QB **Taysom Hill** threw a 27-yard touchdown pass to **Austin Carr** to pull the saints within seven. Hill provided the Saints offense a spark in the second half, orchestrating scoring drives on three of the offense's four last possessions. The Saints' third year signal caller finished the game leading the team in rushing for the second week in a row on five carries for 53 yards and completed 11-of-15 passes for 136 yards and two touchdowns. New Orleans added six more points when he threw a one-yard touchdown pass to RB **Devin Ozigbo** to pull the Saints within one, but failed the subsequent two-point conversion.

The Saints' defense forced another Charger punt and gave Hill and the offense an opportunity to complete the comeback. The offense delivered as K **Wil Lutz** drilled the 28-yard go-ahead field goal with 1:05 remaining. Saints' LB **Colton Jumper** sealed the game when he intercepted Chargers rookie QB **Easton Stick**, sealing a second half shutout by the Saints' defense and the team's first victory of the 2019 preseason.

NEW ORLEANS SAINTS VS LOS ANGELES CHARGERS SUNDAY, AUG. 18, 2019 • DIGNITY HEALTH SPORTS PARK SAINTS POSTGAME NOTES

- The Saints defeated the Chargers, 19-17, improving their preseason record to 1-1. New Orleans will return to action on Saturday, August 24 when they play the New York Jets at MetLife Stadium. Kickoff is set for 6:30pm CST.
- The Saints finished the game with 324 total yards, including 163 rushing yards and 161 passing yards. New Orleans outgained Los Angeles on the ground; Los Angeles finished with 78 rushing yards and 226 passing yards.
- QB **Teddy Bridgewater** started the game for New Orleans and played until the final 1:38 of the first half, finishing 5-of-12 for 40 yards, an interception, and a fumble lost.
- QB **Taysom Hill** entered the game late in the second quarter and played the entire second half for New Orleans, finishing the game as the Saints' leading rusher, rushing for 55 yards on four carries, including a long of 23. Hill led New Orleans on three scoring drives and finished with 136 yards and two touchdowns on 11-of-15 passing. Hill completed passes to seven different receivers.
- RB **Latavius Murray** finished the game with four carries for 13 yards.
- K **Wil Lutz** converted field goals of 33 and 28 yards in the game and added one extra point, finishing the game 2-of-2 on field goals and 1-of-1 on extra point attempts.
- WR **Austin Carr** scored the Saints first touchdown of the game on a 27-yard reception from Hill. The scored capped off a 5-play, 60-yard drive. Carr also led the team in receiving yards with 27.
- New Orleans drove 69 yards on 11 plays to bring the Saints within one point on a 1-yard touchdown pass from Hill to RB **Devin Ozigbo**. The Saints failed the subsequent two-point conversion attempt.
- Ozigbo led New Orleans in carries, finishing the game with eight carries for 30 carries. Ozigbo also led the team in receptions, with three catches for 23 yards.
- RB **Dwayne Washington** rushed five times for 30 yards. Washington also returned one kickoff for 22 yards.
- LB **A.J. Klein** finished the game with four tackles, including a stop on fourth-and-one on the Chargers first possession, a pass break-up, and intercepted Chargers QB Tyrod Taylor in the first quarter.
- LB **Colton Jumper** recorded the Saints second interception of the game, sealing the contest for New Orleans. Jumper added four tackles and a pass defense.
- LB **Kaden Elliss** and LB **Darnell Sankey** each led New Orleans with six tackles.
- DE **Marcus Davenport** recorded a half sack with CB **Eli Apple** as well as two quarterback hits and one tackle.
- CB **Justin Hardee** led the team with two pass breakups.
- New Orleans' S **Vonn Bell**, DT **David Onyemata**, and DE **Corbin Kaufusi** each recorded a pass defense. Bell added two tackles, and Kaufusi added one tackle.
- WR **Deonte Harris** returned five punts for 55 yards (11.0 avg.) and a long of 26. Harris also returned two kickoffs for a total of 50 yards (25.0 avg) and a long of 29 yards.
- Collectively, Los Angeles and New Orleans accounted for 200 penalty yards on 19 penalties.

LOS ANGELES CHARGERS vs. NEW ORLEANS SAINTS POSTGAME TRANSCRIPTS Sunday, Aug. 18, 2019 | ROKiT Field at Dignity Health Sports Park | Carson, Calif.

LOS ANGELES CHARGERS HEAD COACH ANTHONY LYNN

Opening statement:

"For three quarters, I thought it was pretty good complementary football. The fourth quarter, [Saints QB] Taysom Hill took it over and they completely outplayed us in the fourth quarter. Early on I saw some good things once the offensive line settled down from the two holding calls early. I thought they did some really good things. [QB] Cardale Jones, I thought he had his best game as a Charger. I liked the way he handled offense going up and down the field for 98 yards. [We had] a nice punt return from [RB Troyaine] Pope. It didn't surprise us. He's been flashing at camp, so he's coming on, but I was disappointed that we couldn't finish the game in the fourth quarter. As I said, Taysom Hill, I take my hat off to him. He's a heck of an athlete, he's a heck of a quarterback. He just took that game over."

On QB Cardale Jones:

"It's nice to see a player work as hard as he's worked at it and get better. Last week, he had one play that was taken back, but I thought he played decent last week as well. He's been doing it at practice. He's been calling extra meetings with young players. He is working at it, he's doing things that good quarterbacks do in this league. They work their tail off, they hold everyone else accountable and they help the players around him."

On what's been the difference with Jones:

"I think maturity, to be honest with you. It's, I think, the first time in his life he's been in the same system for consecutive seasons. It's made a big difference."

"I think he is understanding that if you want to be good at this league and take your game to the next level, you definitely have to outwork and work as hard as anyone with no sympathy. Not saying that he wasn't a hard worker, but the things that I see now, all the extra effort that he's doing, I didn't see before."

On the running game:

"I thought at times we ran the ball well. We had a couple runs early on where it wasn't so good. I give the Saints defense credit, those linebackers came downhill. I don't like the fact that on fourth-and-one — a little bit longer than a yard — we don't get that. I put us in those situations in preseason to see how we respond. It was a scenario where we did not respond the way I thought we would today."

On RB Justin Jackson:

"I think he's a solid runner. He's a good back. He's done some good things for us. He's had a good camp."

On DT Jerry Tillery's sack:

"You know, it looks like Jerry played pretty well. I've got to watch the tape to see how he played every down, but I like the fact that he got the sack and he wasn't even close. He did some good things out there tonight."

On WR Andre Patton:

"Andre, I thought he did some good things this evening. He stepped up. He made some plays. He's been doing the same thing in practice. There are some position battles going on at the wide receiver position. We're looking for someone to step up to separate and Andre made a move tonight."



On RB Troymaine Pope:

"You know his instincts, his quickness. His first-step explosion is as good as a lot of backs I've been around. I saw that last year with him on the scout team. We gave him more opportunities this year and he's taken advantage of it."

On LB Denzel Perryman:

"You know, Denzel coming off that injury and is a little rusty. Just trying to get him more reps, get him caught up so that he can get back to being Denzel."

On LB Uchenna Nwosu:

"Yeah, not sure what's going on with that yet, but I did see him walk off the field. He was playing pretty good ball before that."

On the defense:

"You know that's the way our defense has always been. They bend, but they don't break. They protect every inch. A lot of times they get in those situations and they make a play. I don't think we can count on that, but that's kind of where we've been. So, red zone defense — I thought it was pretty good today."

On S Derwin James Jr.:

"He's planning on having his surgery. When we know more, we'll let you know."

"I can't put a timetable on that."

On S Jaylen Watkins:

"It's good to see him healthy and back on the field. He's a versatile athlete. He can play corner, he can play nickel, he can play safety and he does some things on special teams. He's competing with some young kids — [S] Roderic Teamer. He's had a good camp, so we'll see how that works out."

On QB Easton Stick's fourth quarter:

"You know, he had some penalties that put him behind the eight-ball. He started inside the 10 a couple of times and then he had a critical first down called back. So, his drives really got stalled by penalties and he never really got going, but Easton's doing well."

LOS ANGELES CHARGERS WIDE RECEIVER ANDRE PATTON**On his touchdown catch:**

"It was just something we had seen throughout the week with the joint practice and from just watching film. It was a perfect play at the right time."

On his preseason:

"So far, so good. I wasn't able to play the first game and I think that definitely gave me a little more juice this game."

On his comfort with the offense:

"I feel comfortable. With my first two years being my developmental years and this year really having a chance to go out there and make those plays, it's exciting."

On his chemistry with QB Cardale Jones:

"We have definitely built a relationship the last three years. We were both on the practice squad. Before the home games we would always work out and run routes. You can see in practice that our chemistry is there."

LOS ANGELES CHARGERS RUNNING BACK TROYMAINE POPE**On the punt return touchdown:**

"I just wanted to make sure I caught the ball. Once I caught the ball, I just let my natural ability take over. My cover team did a good job. I have to give all credit to them."

On the blocking for the touchdown:

"I saw the hole and made the first man miss. After the great block. It was a straight shot from there. I just used my speed to get into the end zone."



On his mindset for this preseason:

"I just want to focus on finishing right now. I'm not worried on what I did in the past."

On his special teams opportunities:

"The opportunities I'm having right now, I'm really trying to make the most of it. They're giving me a chance, I have to capitalize on it."

LOS ANGELES CHARGERS DEFENSIVE TACKLE JERRY TILLERY**On how he felt:**

"I felt great. No issues with my body. It felt good to be out there."

On the teams defensive presence:

"I think we were able to watch what they have done in practice and also their last game against Minnesota. That's a part of the game, scouting your opponent and having a plan going up against them."

On his sack:

"It was good to get out there and do what I've been working on in training camp. These are things we work on every day and we were able to get the right looks in the game. That's what we work and train for, and that's what we want to happen as a defensive line. It just worked today."

LOS ANGELES CHARGERS SAFETY JAYLEN WATKINS**On the team playing without S Derwin James Jr.:**

"Now it's just about finding the right people to piece together out there and communicate the best together. We'll be fine. We've got to pick it up as a group. Not one player can replace Derwin. It's going to take all of us all four or five out there to pick up the slack."

On the opportunity to play more:

"We're always waiting for an opportunity. When our guy went down — he's our guy — but at the same time, it's an opportunity for other guys on special times to maybe get on the field. You never know you need."

On his first game since last preseason:

"It was cool to make a play, get some guys on the ground."

On the red zone defense:

"We are preparing for the season — that is from the bottom half of the roster to the top. Everybody thinks they have a shot to make this team and everyone wants to perform at a high level. We know what [Head] Coach [Anthony] Lynn expects from us. [Defensive Coordinator] Gus [Bradley] talks about getting tips and overthrows. It's something we talk about every day."



NEW ORLEANS SAINTS HEAD COACH SEAN PAYTON

Opening statement:

"I told our players after that game, it felt like there was obviously two different halves. A lot of things that were frustrating, discouraging. Things that we're going to have to clean up when we watch the tape tomorrow. Then, there were some things that were more encouraging in the second half. By no means is it a game you come away from and feel like you're ready for the regular season. We have a lot of work still to do. I thought we played pretty good defense early in the game. I thought offensively, we were awful."

On how much stock QB Taysom Hill gets for leading the Saints to a victory:

"It's always been a game of emotion and momentum, and I thought he did a really good job of that. That's real. So quite a bit of stock."

On if today was an example of how many things Hill can do well:

"Yeah. I was encouraged. I think he had a good camp. He and [QB] Teddy [Bridgewater] both, I feel like, have progressed. I've seen it day to day out in practice. Teddy was sick and I probably should have got him out of the game earlier, but we weren't going to play [QB] Drew [Brees]. Then Taysom came in and did a really good job."

On if he calls plays differently depending on which QB is playing:

"I think it's easier to do when they're in as a starter for a game. It's a little more challenging as you put a plan together. I thought [OC] Pete [Carmichael] did a good job of utilizing some of the things that those guys do differently than Drew [Brees]. You're trying to maybe highlight some things that they do specifically well. Now, some of them were just scrambles and he's pretty good when he's running."

On WR Deonte Harris:

"He should have caught the one that landed on the ground. That bothered me. It's a little bit of you don't know what you're going to get, yet you see some good signs. I'm encouraged, but just some of the details he has to work on. He's certainly confident and you see his quickness."

On if Teddy Bridgewater's sickness played a role on his performance today:

"Well, he didn't get a lot of help. There were a lot of dirty hands in those drives early on, offensively. We got the ball inside the 50 and just didn't pull the job. That's why I felt like it was really two different halves when you watch the game."

On if some of Bridgewater's incompletions were because he was rushed:

"I'd want to see the film before I evaluate each one."

On having two turnovers inside the 10 yard-line:

"Make no mistake about it, I said in the beginning, there's some things that just eat at you a little bit. You can't do [that] as a team and expect to win against good teams. Those are the things that we have to get correct."

On DE Trey Hendrickson:

"He's had a good camp. I like where his weight is at. He plays with great energy and effort. I'm anxious to watch and give the grades, but I thought he was active as well."

On what has been holding DE Hendrickson back the past few years:

"Well, it's his third year. Last year, I thought his weight got a little light. This year, he's playing a little stronger and a little heavier."



NEW ORLEANS SAINTS QUARTERBACK TEDDY BRIDGEWATER

Opening statement:

"What an exciting finish to a football game. It's great to see the guys be able to fight for four quarters and come out with the victory. It was a game of momentum — momentum shifts — and our guys did a great job of taking over the momentum the second half and keeping it. We came out with the victory, get to head back to New Orleans and prepare for New York."

On being sick for today's game:

"I came down with something about two days ago, but I owe it to those guys to be out there. We practice together. We give our all when we're out there. I think I just have to do a better job fighting through difficult situations and things like that. Our guys are still out there competing at a high level, and I have to be out there. If I'm out there with those guys I have to continue to elevate my game, and today was just one of those days where things weren't clicking the way I hope they would."

On how he would evaluate his performance today:

"It was a poor game. Missed a couple throws. The energy wasn't there on my behalf. I have to do a better job. Like I said, when I'm dealing with things — just still being able to provide energy. Those guys feed off my energy. When I walk into that huddle guys like to see confidence, a guy who they believe in and today I just didn't give those guys the energy that we deserve."

On his interception that was intended for RB Dwayne Washington:

"It's something that came up back in the spring, and coach mentioned it to me. Sometimes when I get off my progression, I get to the check down, and sometimes I get to it too fast. It was one of those things that happened. I got off the guy. We ran a pattern. They covered it well, and I was going through progression, getting to the back and just have to throw a better ball — a catchable ball. Those guys — they're not wide receivers, but I guess I just have to throw them a better pass and avoid turning the ball over in that situation."

On the fumbled snap:

"That was some miscommunication. That's something we've been taking pride in all training camp. We haven't had that many errors like that around camp, so I'm pretty sure we'll make the corrections tomorrow. Tomorrow's a 'Tell the Truth Monday,' and you have to continue to try to get better and move forward and not let the same things happen again."

NEW ORLEANS SAINTS QUARTERBACK TYSOM HILL

On if the second half was fun:

"Absolutely. We talk about it all the time, and sometimes you're in Training Camp and you have long days and you forget, and you oftentimes have to remind yourself a reason to play this game. This isn't work and it's a lot of fun and it's a lot of fun to have the opportunity that people give to you. Having the opportunity to get on the field and play is a great opportunity."

On if today was an example of all the things he can do well as a QB:

"Yeah, I think so. I haven't seen all the numbers. I have to go back and watch it. I felt like we were able to move the ball. Things broke down and we were able to avoid negative plays. We had a sack but we were able to come back from that and convert on third down. I think having the ability to make plays and things like that, it just makes us more difficult to stop and avoid making negative plays."

On his scramble in the third quarter:

"I was trying to get the ball over there and see if we broke free. I felt pressure and I had to avoid, and unfortunately I had to avoid away from the route and the concept that we had going. At that point, I was just trying to avoid a negative play. I felt like I could get the edge rather than throwing the ball away and try to get some yards, and we were able to do that. I tried to get what I could, avoid the hit and get down."

On if his coaches tell him to get down more than he does:

"I've never had a specific conversation of, 'Hey, you need to protect yourself.' I think it's kind of an unwritten rule. I try to do that, I tell them all the time, but I feel like I can break a tackle, so it's hard to bring myself up. I think there are opportunities where you can go down and protect yourself. I felt like today, I can't think of one unnecessary hit I took. I got sacked but that's the only one that comes to mind."



On how much he takes responsibility for keeping the team focused:

"Everything starts with us [quarterbacks]. We touch the ball every play and after a play, you try to create a mindset that, 'Hey, on to the next.' I would say the only thing that's really frustrating for me, and sometimes as a quarterback, you have to check yourself, but you can't let the previous play dictate what's going to happen next play. Look, everyone on the team wants to go out and be really successful and they're going to go out and do the best that they can every play. Stuff happens. The only frustrating thing is that guys let that linger. I didn't think that happened tonight. We had a couple turnovers and we bounced back. I thought that was a really good thing coming out of the game."

On QB Teddy Bridgewater being sick today:

"It's a tough game and it's a tough position to play if you're not able to give it 100 percent. It really is demanding and requires 100 percent of your energy and focus. It makes it difficult."

On if he could tell Bridgewater was sick:

"Yeah, I mean I think he was a little down energy-wise today. He was feeling crumby throughout the week. We knew that. We tried to help him out when we could and allow him to get some rest throughout the week when the opportunity presented itself."

On how he brings as much energy as he can to each game:

"I think we've all been there. We've played the game for long enough that you're not going to feel 100 percent. This game is very important to be 100 percent as you go into a game. I think you just try to focus even more. I think there are a lot of distractions throughout the week and throughout the season. Certainly, being sick and having something nagging at you adds to that. I think you just have to be conscious of staying in the moment and it requires you to stay focused even harder. You just do the best you can."

On how much he focuses on winning the game:

"That is the objective. In halftime, Coach [Sean Payton] obviously wasn't too happy with the way we were playing offensively. We had great opportunities and our defense played really well. We slaughtered a few opportunities there. Coach let us know that he was not happy with the way we were going. Again, as a Quarterback and a guy that is calling plays, controlling the huddle, touching the ball every play, it came down to me. When I had the opportunity to play the second half, I felt like we needed some energy. The thing that I kept reiterating in the huddle was, we're going to have the opportunity to win this football game. I know it's a preseason game, but this is what it's all about. If we came out here to not win, then we're wrong. That was the objective."

On the pass he threw to WR Austin Carr:

"We were at a four-by-one formation which sometimes can be difficult for defenses and most defenses will have some checks. I saw the defender go out underneath it, but then I saw him turn back to me into a running back. The second I saw his body language come back to the halfback, I confirmed that the corner was with our outside receiver and I knew he was going to be open. I just threw him the ball."

On joint practices with the Los Angeles Chargers:

"It certainly helped us prepare. You get a couple days seeing their defenses so you kind of know what you're going to see on game day. You know what their bread and butter is. Certainly, some of the pressures that you can expect. From that standpoint, it makes it easier on the quarterback when you've seen all these looks before, actually against them. That was helpful. I think overall, just practicing with the Chargers, it's kind of hard when you go through training camp, you have two weeks and you're just practicing with each other. It really creates an opportunity to kind of see where you're at, at the beginning, and evaluate yourself and as a team, as a whole. I thought it was a great opportunity for us."

NEW ORLEANS SAINTS RUNNING BACK ALVIN KAMARA**On QB Taysom Hill's performance in the second half:**

"We've seen it for two years now — every time he has the ball in his hands, he controls the offense and does his job. He made some good plays, had some great runs, and gave us some life in the second half."

On QB Teddy Bridgewater's sickness and how it impacted his performance:

"I knew he was sick and it's tough to compete and do well at your job on the field when you're sick. Hopefully he gets better soon."



On WR/RS Deonte Harris' performance as a returner today:

"He's doing well. I think he has a good neck for it and he looks natural. He just has to lock in a little bit more and catch every ball. Every ball has to be caught, it's just different now. We are playing a game of fielding positions and I think he understands that. He had a couple good returns and it's only his second week back there fielding those punts; So, he's learning."

On how the team will move forward after injuries to offensive linemen:

"We will be fine and we still have some time. It really comes down to the next man stepping up. Hopefully, those guys can get healthy. I'm not sure what the actual injuries are, but my prayers to them so that they can bounce back. However, there are guys in that room ready to play and that's our next man mentality."

NEW ORLEANS SAINTS LINEBACKER A.J. KLEIN**On his interception:**

"I was basically in the right place at the right time. I didn't do anything special, the ball was tipped. We had pressure on the quarterback and forced a bad throw. So right place, right time — I didn't do anything extraordinary."

On first-team defense being locked in:

"I think, coming off of last week, we were a little bit disappointed with a few big plays that we gave up, some explosive plays. Coming back, we wanted to be able to stop the run game and obviously get off the field on third downs. I think we did that, so that's a step forward. But second and third groups, obviously we still have things to improve on. [We had] some self-inflicted wounds, personal fouls, but I think we came out in the second half, especially in the fourth quarter and definitely turned the momentum back in our favor. And obviously, the interception to seal the game, too."

On DE Trey Hendrickson:

"I think Trey has been overlooked these past few years. Obviously, he's starting to find his niche in this defense. He had a great week of practice. He was very disruptive both days. He is definitely coming out strong for us, and he's a situational pass rusher for us, as well as a guy who can play team. I know he wishes he would've had that sack that he got close on, but all that matters is that he's getting into the quarterback's face."

On Hendrickson's progression:

"I think he's got a great understanding of the defense. He really understands fronts, alignments, and he's become a student of the game. [He has also] worked on his technique, and that goes to [Defensive Line] Coach Ryan [Nielson] and the defensive line working with these guys. He came in a little heavier this year, which is good for him and I think it's definitely paying off."

On Hendrickson not being talkative:

"No, Trey is very reserved as far as he really keeps to himself. Obviously, he can be fiery on the field, which we like as long as we keep him in check. I think he definitely brings a lot of positives to this football team and I think he'll be a force to reckon with once the regular season comes."

When you're evaluating players, how do you sort of balance watching the players execution versus the unit they're lined up against?

"That factors in a lot, and sometimes that's depending on the position, it's a challenging position. It can be challenging for the running back, the quarterback. We try to, as best we can, get them with other personnel that are on the field. That's part of it."

It said on the CBS broadcast that you've compared Taysom Hill or said he may be the next Steve Young. Obviously, that's a little grandiose.

"If you look back at Steve's career and people do not remember his time before he came into the NFL, you had a very athletic player that I think advanced when he got to San Francisco and he always had great ability with his legs. You're trying to create visions for players no different than how you would evaluate, you know, how you see Teddy (Bridgewater) progressing, what he can be in and I think that that is the business we are in."

Saying something like that speaks you still have a vision for Hill at quarterback.

"Absolutely. That hasn't changed. Right now we just feel like as we continue to work on those skillsets, there's other things that he's able to do to help the team and he's done those pretty well."

I know you only get to see so many preseason games, but with everything you've added up, how much has he developed as a passer and reads and progression?

"I said this yesterday and a week ago. I think we've seen a significant growth with both he and Teddy. This is Teddy's second full year and Taysom the same. We're seeing things take place on a day to day basis that maybe weren't happening a year ago."

You have (C.J.) Gardner-Johnson playing in the slot. Is that like the kind of "Buffalo" thing you and the defensive coaching staff did the last couple of years? Is that as like a nickel corner or is that kind of like a hybrid? How do you kind of see that?

"We would consider Buffalo because his natural position would be a safety. So, I do not know that you can take any strong safety and play them in that position. But one of the things that we felt he did very well in college was play in that slot position. So, he received more reps at it in (the) Buffalo (package) yesterday than the first week (vs. Minnesota Vikings). The first week he played more safety snaps. So, a lot of it depends on the gameplan and who we're playing. But yeah, it's one of the things that we feel like he can do well."

Does that require him to learn more than a typical guy in his position?

"Learning some nickel responsibilities when it comes to your man to man into your zone looks. He's someone (who) I think picks things up pretty quick and still working and he still has a ton of room for growth, but we think that was from the very beginning a vision we had for him."

That Steve Young vision you had for Taysom (Hill), is that something you had right away when he got here or did it kind of develop over time?

"No, I think that was something that as you began to watch his skillset you're just trying to think of players that were similar at an early stage in your career."

Emmanuel Butler has been out a little bit, but is there something he has done that kind of shows promise?

"We've seen some, you guys have all seen it and now it's just seeing them on a more consistent basis. I think these next two weeks will be important for him. He came back after missing a little bit of time, but he's high pointed the ball well. I've seen strong hands in traffic and a lot of things you want to see from a young player."

How's his blocking?

"I think decent. I'd say somewhat raw still in learning the force patterns and who to block. But that's something we feel like we can correct. He's certainly willing."

What did you like about Austin Carr when he first got here?

"He is a savvy player. He is smart. He understands route principles versus man and zone. I think he transitions real well in and out of his cuts. I think the production and the football IQ, all of those things factors in."

At this stage of the preseason, you're going into the third game. What are you looking for some from some of these guys that are maybe on the bubble?

I think overall, our first half yesterday; I thought we started well defensively. I thought we were sloppy offensively. I thought our tempo lacked. I think overall, all the details that go into playing well; I think we have to improve on. I think this is a good week for us really to focus on the little things specifically to what we've seen in the game. I know we have an installation and a plan for this week and yet, we have to be able to midstream adjust a little bit and pay attention to what we're seeing. So I think the details and what it takes to execute offensively, there were a lot of things for us to coach off of in the kicking game video this morning and the same way defensively."

How do you view that competition going between some of those young guys at wide receiver? It looks like you have a lot of guys competing for maybe one or two spots.

"That process is still going, it's still ongoing."

Colton Jumper was a guy that was around a little bit last year. Is there any specific area you've seen him progress?

"His strength is playing in the special teams and that is where he would be competing to make the team. There are a few other guys that are competing for similar spots. We talk about it every year, you're not just competing with the guys that are in your room, you are competing with the other 31 rooms (teams) at the same position, possibly (at) other positions. So really focusing maybe more on the things you can control as a player and less on what you think the cutline might be is important.
