NEW ORLEANS SAINTS

NEW ORLEANS SAINTS WIN FOUR OF THEIR LAST FIVE GAMES IN 2025; TEAM HOLDS THE EIGHTH OVERALL PICK IN THE 2026 NFL DRAFT AND EIGHT TOTAL SELECTIONS

SEASON IN REVIEW

Led by first-year Head Coach **Kellen Moore** in concert with Executive Vice-President/General Manager **Mickey Loomis**, the 2025 New Orleans Saints finished strong by capturing four of their last five games, finishing with a 6-11 record. The roster comprised of young talent mixed with veteran experience on both offense and defense led to both individual and team successes. The continued leadership of team captain veterans in LB **Demario Davis**, DE **Cameron Jordan**, RB **Alvin Kamara** and C **Erik McCoy**, combined with promising young players in WR **Chris Olave** and DE **Chase Young**, productive free agent and trade acquisitions in C **Luke Fortner**, S **Justin Reid** and WR **Devaughn Vele** and the 2025 rookie class, all impressed this season, leading into the 2026 campaign.

QB **Tyler Shough** and WR **Chris Olave** led the way offensively for the Saints. Assuming the starting role in Week Nine, Shough, the team's second round selection, completed 221-of-327 passes [67.6%] for 2,384 yards with ten touchdowns passes and just six interceptions, good for a 91.3 passer rating. He also rushed for 186 yards with three touchdowns and added a two-point conversion. He led the Saints on three game-winning drives on the season, all in the month of December.

Olave became only the second Saint to record 100 catches in a season, rebounding from a 2024 season where he missed nine games due to two concussions, earning *Associated Press* second-team All-Pro, recording 100 catches for 1,163 yards and nine touchdowns. Finishing seventh in the NFL in receiving, Olave finished third in the NFL with 30 third down receptions, while his seven touchdown catches on third down led the entire league.

On the defensive side, which finished ninth in the National Football League in opponent net yards per game, edge rushers **Cameron Jordan** and **Chase Young** were one of only three duos in the NFL to each finish the season with double-digit sacks. Jordan led the club with 10.5 quarterback take-downs, becoming only the second player in NFL record books to have double-digit sacks for the same team ten times in his career. Despite missing the first five games with an injury, Young rebounded to record a career-high ten takedowns for the first time in his career, tying for the NFL lead with three fumble recoveries, two of them forced and one returned for a touchdown. Earning NFC Defensive Player of the Month honors in December/January, Young recorded 19 tackles, six stops for loss, five sacks, one forced fumble and two recoveries down the stretch.

At the linebacker position, **Demario Davis** led the Black and Gold in tackles for the eighth consecutive season with 143 tackles [64 solo], while **Pete Werner** finished with 81 stops, a career-high five pass breakups and three fumble recoveries.

In the secondary, a unit ranked fourth in the NFL in opponent net passing yards per game, CB **Kool-Aid McKinstry** led the team in both interceptions [three] and pass breakups [17]. **Alontae Taylor** provided a formidable presence as well, leading the secondary with 83 tackles [59 solo], two interceptions, two sacks and 11 pass breakups. Rookie S **Jonas Sankner** tied for the team lead with three takeaways, while Reid provided stability to the back end with 72 tackles and a 49-yard interception return for a touchdown.

The club enters the 2026 offseason with the No. 8 overall pick in this year's NFL Draft, which is set to take place from April 23-25 in Pittsburgh, Pa.

2025 GAME SUMMARIES

WEEK 1: Arizona Cardinals 20, New Orleans Saints 13; September 7 @ Caesars Superdome -



The New Orleans Saints fell to the Arizona Cardinals in the 2025 season opener for both teams, despite rebounding from a 20-10 third quarter deficit to come within an end zone throw of a game-tying touchdown. Heroics on offense, defense and special

teams aided the Black and Gold in a promising fourth quarter. With 4:40 left in the contest, Saints DT Bryan Bresee blocked a 46-yard field goal attempt. QB Spencer Rattler then converted a trio of first downs on throws to TE Juwan Johnson and WR Devaughn Vele and a 12-yard scramble by the signal-caller to set up a 28-yard field goal by K Blake Grupe with 2:44 left.

New Orleans then forced a three-and-out, punctuated by a third down sack of Cardinals QB Kyler Murray by CB Alontae Taylor for a 15-yard loss to get New Orleans the ball back with 1:49 left.

Rattler helped advance the Saints to the Cardinals 18-yard line to set up three tries at the end zone, the closest being a laser to Johnson that was broken up by Arizona defenders Jalen Thompson and Budda Baker.

Rattler completed 27-of-46 passes for 214 yards and carried four times for 29 yards. Johnson led the Saints in receiving with eight grabs for 76 yards. Murray completed 21-of-29 passes for 163 yards with two TDs and a 108.8 passer rating, carrying seven times for 38 yards. New Orleans RB Alvin Kamara's first half 18-yard rushing touchdown was the 1,000th touchdown scored at the Caesars Superdome.

New Orleans outgained Arizona through the air, 208-130, but the Cardinals held the ball for 33:46 of the contest to win the time of possession battle. The loss snapped a six-game winning streak for the Saints in season openers. The Saints fell to 15-17 against the Cardinals in the all-time regular season series.

Week 2: San Francisco 49ers 26, New Orleans Saints 21; September 14 @ Caesars Superdome - The New Orleans Saints dropped their second game of the season to the 49ers, despite bouncing back from a 26-14 early fourth quarter deficit to have a chance of winning the game in the final minutes.

"We've got to play cleaner football, in all three phases," said Coach Kellen Moore. "There's only so many opportunities in these games and you have to value each and every opportunity in all three phases, and when they present themselves you've got to take advantage of them because there's only so many."

An impressive drive and defensive stops paved the way for New Orleans to be back in it in the very end. After going down two scores with 12:18 left in the fourth, quarterback Spencer Rattler and company made some magic happen, converting three first downs to wide receiver Chris Olave and running back Alvin Kamara to set up an eventual three-yard TD to wide receiver Devaughn Vele. The score capped off a 13 play, 71-yard drive in six minutes flat to bring the Saints back within five. After two three-and-out drives by both teams, Rattler led a charge that just fell short. Starting on the New Orleans' six yard-line with 2:40 left, the signal-caller picked up two first downs before the 49ers defense became too much to handle. Rattler completed 25-of-34 passes (73.5 pct.) for 207 yards with career-highs of three passing TDs and a 118.1 rating.

49ers quarterback Mac Jones went 26-of-39 for 279 yards and threw three TDs with a 113.1 passer rating. New Orleans outgained San Francisco on the ground, 121-77, but the 49ers beat the Saints in passing yardage, 344-307, and were 53% (8-for-15) on third down to New Orleans' 36% (four-for-11).

Week 3: Seattle Seahawks 44, New Orleans Saints 13; September 21, 2025 @ Lumen Field - New Orleans' season continued to get off to a rocky start, as they fell to the Seahawks at Lumen Field.

The Saints got off to a solid start with the ball first and quarterback Spencer Rattler completed a pass to wide receiver Chris Olave and running back Alvin Kamara gained seven yards to put the team near midfield. However the drive stalled out and the Saints failed to convert on fourth down.

After a Seattle first down, the Saints stopped two run plays for one-yard gains, but DT Bryan Bresee was assessed a 12-yard unnecessary roughness penalty on third down that extended a drive and set up a TD. The Seahawks extended their lead to 21-0 by the end of the first quarter, where rookie WR Tory Horton returned a punt 95 yards for a touchdown and blocked punt set up a third score.

On a drive spanning the first and second quarter, the Saints got on the scoreboard with a Blake Grupe field goal, but the Seahawks took advantage of a long kickoff return to set up a scoring play of a 14-yard pass from QB Sam Darnold to Horton.

The Seahawks took a halftime 38-6 lead, while the Black and Gold kept up their intensity, holding Seattle to a pair of field goals and recording a turnover, while TE Jack Stoll scored his first touchdown.

Rattler completed 28-of-39 passes for 218 yards with a touchdown. Olave had a career-high ten catches.

Week 4: Buffalo Bills 30, New Orleans Saints 19; September 28 @ Highmark Stadium - New Orleans faced a 11-point deficit with 6:42 left in the third quarter and was able to cut it to two with 8:53 left in the game, but the Saints never led. New Orleans rushed for a season-high 189 yards, scoring a touchdown on their first possession for the first time this season. But with Buffalo leading 14-7 in the second quarter, New Orleans was unable to capitalize or score points, when rookie S Jonas Sanker had his first career interception near midfield early in the second quarter. QB Spencer Rattler connected with WR Chris Olave for a three-yard touchdown late in the third quarter to reduce Buffalo's lead to 21-16, followed by a field goal early in the fourth quarter. But the Bills answered with a four-play, 60-yard drive to gain a nine-point advantage. This was followed by a Saints drive that stalled at the Buffalo 43 on downs and the Bills took advantage of a roughing the punter penalty to hold onto the ball and kick a field goal with 2:12 left.

DE Cameron Jordan recovered the football as Dart, laying across Jordan's legs, disgustedly put both hands over his face.



Week 5: New Orleans Saints 26, New York Giants 14; October 5, 2025 @ Caesars Superdome - Spencer Rattler was so fired up by the sight of Rashid Shaheed hauling in his deep throw down the right sideline that the second-year quarterback started springing the length of the field to join the celebration.

"Probably the fastest I ran all game," Rattler quipped when asked about chasing Rashid to the end zone. "Those plays create energy for the whole team, the whole crowd and we definitely want to have more of those."

Such moments had been rare for New Orleans since late last season, which ended with the Saints on a four-game skid before the Moore era began with four more losses to start the 2025 season.

That changed Sunday against the Giants (1-4) - also the previous team to lose to the Saints last Dec. 8. And after the game, the Saints transformed their home locker room - equipped with a sound system and color-changing LED lighting - into "Club Dub" for the first time since beating the Cleveland Browns on November 17.

"It's been a while since we had the fog and the music playing afterward," Howden said. "I almost forgot how that was."

The 37-year old Moore celebrated his first victory since last season's Super Bowl - a game also played in the Caesars Superdome, when he was Philadelphia's offensive coordinator.

"This is a special group," Moore said, praising Saints players' "resiliency to hang in there through some challenging times the first month."

Rattler earned his first victory in 11 career starts, passing for 225 yards without turning the ball over or taking a sack, while Shaheed finished with four catches for 114 yards for the Saints (1-4).

"It feels good to get that first win," Rattler said. "It was a team win. The defense played great. The offensive line was elite."

Giants rookie Jaxson Dart, who won his first career start in Week Four, passed for 202 yards and two touchdowns, but also turned the ball over three times, the first when the ball slipped from his hand during a scramble in the third quarter.

DE Cameron Jordan recovered the football as Dart, laying across Jordan's legs, disgustingly put both hands over his face.

"We had a lot of opportunities and moved the ball just fine," Dart said. "We hurt ourselves. We just kind of gave this game away."

Dart threw his first two career interceptions in the fourth quarter - both caught by Kool-Aid McKinstry for his first career picks.

New York committed five turnovers in all, none more costly than when RB Cam Skattebo was stripped by DT Bryan Bresee at the Saints 12-yard line, giving Howden the chance to scoop the loose ball on the 14 and sprint untouched the other way early in the fourth quarter.

"It was a game-changing play," Moore said.

Indeed, the Giants were threatening to score a go-ahead touchdown when Howden saw the ball on the ground behind the line of scrimmage, picked it up and recalled thinking, "Just run - run for my life." Dart completed his first five passes for 44 yards, capped by a short TD to TE Theo Johnson. He mixed in a 20-yard scramble with three more completions during New York's next series, which ended with Dart's 15-yard strike to Johnson for a 14-3 lead.

New Orleans closed to 14-13 on Shaheed's TD - the Saints' longest offensive play since 2016.

Shaheed said he tried to make S Tyler Nubin believe he was headed across the field to the left, "and once I saw his hips turn, I broke toward the [right] corner and the rest is history."

After Saints K Blake Grupe missed a 52-yard field goal that would have given New Orleans the lead late in the first half, the Saints got the ball back when LB Demario Davis forced receiver Darius Slayton's fumble at the Saints 35 and S Jonas Sanker recovered.

That led to Grupe's short field goal for a 16-14 Saints lead at halftime.

Week 6: New England Patriots 26, New Orleans Saints 19; October 12 @ Caesars Superdome -



It's not the fight, it's the finish.

It's not the play, it's the precision.

It's not the drive, it's the discipline and details.

The New Orleans Saints

[1-5] lost their third one-score game this season in the Caesars Superdome, falling 25-19 to the New England Patriots.

Add that to earlier losses against the Cardinals [20-13] and 49ers [26-21] and the Saints have riddled themselves with "couldas" and "wouldas," not not filled the holes with finished business.

"Tough," CB Alontae Taylor said. "I think it speaks volumes for us, though. Teams ain't just blowing us out like we're just trash. I think we're right there, and we've just got to find that hump and just stay consistent with that and try to get some wins under our belt."

Sunday followed a similar pattern.

QB Spencer Rattler was efficient and turnover-free - 20 of 26 for 227 yards with no interceptions, but no touchdowns. New Orleans split success in its two red zone trips - a short field goal by Blake Grupe and a one-yard touchdown run by Taysom Hill - and settled for field goals when drives stalled at the New England 30-, 20- and 36-yard lines.

Grupe's last field goal, a 54-yarder with 13:41 left in the contest, pulled New Orleans to within 25-19. And the defense, which struggled while allowing the Patriots to convert six of 13 times on third down, forced punts on consecutive New England possessions.

The Saints began their final two possessions of the contest at their own 25- and 10-yard lines. The first ended after two plays when TE Juwan Johnson caught a pass from Rattler over the middle and lost a fumble after a 14-yard gain to the 50, and the second ended after the offense gained 28 yards on five plays.

The Patriots converted one last third down on their final drive - a 21-yard pass on third-and-11 from their own 30-yard line with 2:40 left - that allowed them to run out the clock.

New England QB Drake Maye [18 of 26 for 261 yards and three touchdowns, with no interceptions] had completions of fourth-and-four and third-and-11 [twice] in the second half, while all three touchdown passes came on first down in the first half.

"You're guarding pretty good receivers," Taylor said, noting Maye's ability to extend plays and five receivers extra time to uncover. "They're finding ways, and Drake and them have a pretty good connection."

"So you're just going to find a guy open and throw the ball. We've just got to tighten up on our end. If we've got to cover longer, then we've got to cover longer."

Even though the Patriots didn't convert the game's lone turnover into points, they siphoned 2:45 off the clock and pinned New Orleans deep with a punt. The Saints took possession at their ten-yard line with 5:51 left in the contest.

"It says in the Word, like, don't get tired in doing good," Johnson said. "We have a lot of stuff that we're doing that's good, so don't get tired in doing it. You're going to be rewarded when the time is right. The time isn't right, but one thing we're going to do is just keep working, clean up a few things and that's where we're at. Our red zone efficiency needs to be a little better, that's something we're going to clean up and be a little more efficient. I had a turnover, so obviously clean that up. The biggest thing is just being better and sound. It's just little things that a lot of people don't see, but we see. We'll clean up, we'll do better, we'll come out with a better attitude and a different result next week."

Several winning elements have been displayed. The Saints continue the quest to minimize - if not eliminate the costly ones.

"At the end of the day we did not take advantage of the opportunities that were presented to us," Head Coach Kellen Moore said. "Every game is going to have those opportunities, and you have got to take advantage of them. They won the turnover ratio, they won some of the situational stuff and that's how this game was decided."

"I have got to find a way for myself to coach better, to put ourselves in better situations to be more successful as a football team. Because there is too much good and not enough in those little margins [to be losing]."

Week 7: Chicago Bears 26, New Orleans Saints 14; October 19 @ Soldier Field - The piecemeal approach to winning NFL games continued to fail the Saints at the Chicago Bears.

Flashes of effectiveness [defensive stops, a forced turnover, two impressive TD drives] again could not sufficiently puncture a thicker shield of futility [four turnovers including three interceptions, no run game, inability to stop the run], and the Saints dropped their sixth game in seven outings, 26-14 to the Bears at Soldier Field.

A promising defensive start included a three-and-out punt to open the game, a field goal allowed after the offense committed a turnover deep in New Orleans territory and an interception off Bears QB Caleb Williams. But that buckled under the weight of 222 rushing yards and two touchdowns allowed on 40 carries.



And an offensive flurry that produced consecutive touchdown drives of 91 and 80 yards, each ending on passes from QB Spencer Rattler to WR Chris Olave, was negated by four Rattler turnovers and an invisible run game [44 yards on 17 carries].

Saints first-year coach Kellen Moore echoed the sound of sameness to explain the outcome.

"The theme of that game...we had our chances," Moore said. "I thought our guys battled. I thought our guys put [us] in really good position in the middle of the game to come back and get ourselves back in it. But then we just couldn't keep it going. Credit to those guys - they played better than us, they coached better than us. We've got to find the formula that works."

New Orleans has shown it has the ability to create the elements of the formula. It hasn't been able to create them consistently and sustain them long enough for the scoreboard to reflect the mix.

Rattler (20 of 32 for 233 yards and two TDs, and sacked four times for -24 yards) entered the contest with only one turnover – an interception in September against the Seattle Seahawks – and six touchdowns.

But he was sacked and lost a fumble on the Saints' opening possession, after New Orleans' defense forced a punt on the game's opening drive. And after the Saints punted and Blake Grupe missed his sixth field goal this season to end the second and third drives, Rattler's pass intended for Mason Tipton was intercepted and returned to the Saints 30-yard line to conclude the fourth drive.

Week 8: Tampa Bay Buccaneers 23, New Orleans Saints 3; October 26 @ Caesars Superdome - An inspired defensive effort and a quarterback change wasn't enough for the New Orleans Saints on Sunday, as they dropped a 23-3 decision to the Tampa Bay Buccaneers at the Caesars Superdome.

The Saints turned the ball over four times (two interceptions, one a pick-six) to allow the Bucs to solidify their grip on the NFC South at 6-2. The loss dropped the Saints to 1-7.



Rookie Tyler Shough entered the game with 3:57 to play in the third quarter and the Saints down 17-3 and promptly completed his first pass for six yards to Taysom Hill.

Shough's first series ended when Tampa S Antoine Winfield Jr. took the ball away from Saints WR Chris Olave for an interception. Starter Spencer Rattler was 15 of 21 for 136 yards with a lost fumble and pick-six, leading the Saints to just three points (48-yard Blake Grupe field goal).

Shough finished 17 of 30 for 129 yards.

The Saints defense played exceptional football in the first half, not allowing the Bucs' offense to score while sacking QB Baker Mayfield three times and forcing him to fumble once. Tampa had just 80 yards of offense in the first half. The Saints defense also had a goal-line stand and came close to a second one before Tampa scored on a 1-yard dive in the third quarter.

Alvin Kamara joined another exclusive list when he became the fifth running back in NFL history to have 600 or more receptions. He entered Sunday's game against Tampa Bay needing two receptions to hit the milestone and accomplished that in the final minute of the second quarter. He had two receptions for 24 yards and six carries for 21 yards.

Luke Fortner started at center for the Saints, replacing longtime starter Erik McCoy, who is out for the season with a biceps injury. RB Devin Neal saw his most extensive action of the season as the Saints played without Kendre Miller, who was lost for the season in Week Seven because of a knee injury. WR/RS Rashid Shaheed had nine receptions for 75 yards and WR Chris Olave also added eight grabs for 63 yards.

Week 9: Los Angeles Rams 34, New Orleans Saints 10; November 2 @ SoFi Stadium - It seemed less about what New Orleans didn't do Sunday against Los Angeles, as it was about what the Rams did - clinically, repeatedly and thoroughly - in a 34-10 Rams victory.

The Rams (6-2) scored touchdowns on three of their first four possessions, piled up 77 offensive plays and 438 yards, registered a lopsided time of possession advantage (43:53 to 16:07) and prevented the Saints from conjuring much hope in the first NFL start for Saints rookie QB Tyler Shough.

Shough displayed moments of promise while completing 15 of 24 passes for 176 yards and his first career touchdown pass, with one interception. But the Rams ball-hogged to a gluttonous level, keeping the Saints offense off the field and helping set the state for Los Angeles' defense to allow just 40 offensive plays, 224 yards and ten first downs.

And a week after New Orleans' defense played arguably its best game this season in a 23-3 loss Tampa Bay, it couldn't get off the field (the Rams converted half of their 14 third-down attempts and both fourth down tries, and New Orleans didn't force a turnover and was shredded in the red zone, where Los Angeles scored on four of five trips.

"They controlled so many of the situational football plays," Saints Head Coach Kellen Moore said. "They were able to play a lot more efficiently, run the football better. But third downs, red zone, fourth downs - they were able to control the ball in so many ways." "We didn't get enough shots at it. We didn't get enough opportunities. We've got to play obviously a lot better. A lot of this comes down to the details and the fundamentals of the football game. Sometimes it's a simple game; we've got to play better and give ourselves more opportunities.

"When you look at it, we had 40 snaps on offense - probably an all-time low - and they had 77. So they obviously controlled the ball for much of this game." When the Saints went three-and-out on their first two possessions and the Rams scored touchdowns on two of their last three - a 12-play, 88-yard drive and an 11-play, 62-yard drive that lasted a combined 12:36 - it was a harbinger of things to come.

New Orleans manufactured an eight-play, 44-yard drive in the second quarter that ended with a 39-yard field goal by Blake Grupe to cut its deficit to 13-3.

And when the Rams responded with a three-play, 65-yard punch to push the lead to 20-3 with 6:25 in the half, the teams traded possessions - the Saints punted, the Rams missed a field goal - before the Saints countered with their only touchdown.

The six-play, 71-yard drive began with 54 seconds remaining in the second quarter and included Shough completions to WR Rashid Shaheed (13 yards), TE Juwan Johnson (eight yards), receiver Chris Olave (27 yards), and a roughing the passer penalty that pushed the ball to the Rams' 11-yard line.

On first down from there, Shough found Johnson open a few yards in front of the goal line. Johnson made the catch, spun around a tackle attempt and lunged into the end zone for Shough's first touchdown, and halved the Rams' lead to 20-10 entering halftime.

But that was as far as the momentum went.

Los Angeles opened the second half with an 8-yard touchdown drive that required 16 plays, lasted 9:46 and included two third-down conversions and one fourth-down conversion.

Stafford was sacked twice, by Chase Young and Jonah Williams. Young raised his season total to three sacks in four games, second-most on the team. But Stafford mainly was surgical, completing 24 of 32 passes for 281 yards and four touchdowns, with no interceptions. And with Kyren Williams adding 114 rushing yards and a touchdown on 25 carries, the Saints' defense was in a quandry.

Shough will now look to build off his performance.

"I thought there were some positives that came out of the game from Tyler's perspective," Moore said. "I thought he threw it well. I thought that two-minute drive was big-time football right before the half. Even at the end I thought he made a couple of really good plays to quickly get us down in the red zone and we weren't able to run the football and get a first down."

Week 10: New Orleans Saints 17, Carolina Panthers 7; November 9 @ Bank of America Stadium -



No need to over-dramatize the New Orleans Saints' 17-7 victory over the Carolina Panthers at Bank of America Stadium in Charlotte, N.C. In the grand scheme it was the second win in New Orleans' ten games and in a business measured by wins and loss-

es, everything based on that reality.

But the tingly feeling that tickled fans, and the music inside Club Dub that Saints players blared inside the Visitors' locker room in Carolina, probably felt and sounded like a mixture of relief and hope.

The relief came in the form of a much-needed victory in New Orleans' most complete game of the season, where offense, defense and special teams each ponied up and shared the winnings.

The hope came in the form of a rookie quarterback, Tyler Shough, who made his second career start.

New Orleans' defense came up with two turnovers, held Carolina to 175 yards and produced stops on six of nine third-down attempts; the special teams blocked a field goal and added a field goal: and the offense produced 388 yards and chewed up 33-21 in time of possession on 67 plays.

But Shough, the Saints' second-round pick this year, likely left the biggest imprint. He completed 19 of 27 passes for 282 yards and two touchdowns, with no interceptions. He had touchdown passes of 62 yards to receiver Chris Olave and 30 yards to TE Juwan Johnson, and added another 52-yard completion to Johnson, as New Orleans (2-8) evened its record to 1-1 in his starts.

"Just a great feeling," Shough said. "I think my favorite moment was just seeing everybody in the locker room, dapping everybody up and just kind of the work that everyone has put in to this point. Just a great team win. The defense, special teams, everybody had an impact on the game."

Week 12: Atlanta Falcons 24, New Orleans Saints 10; November 23 @ Caesars Superdome - No need to have searched for a rocket scientist or nuclear physicist on Sunday in the Caesars Superdome.

The New Orleans Saints shot themselves in the foot, then tied a hand behind their back, then got in their own way, then...

You get the idea: In a 24-10 loss to Atlanta, which dropped the Saints to 2-9 and prevented their first two-game winning streak this season, describing why was simple because applicable cliches were appropriate. New Orleans committed such self-injury that the Falcons (4-7) only needed to accept the benevolence and not reciprocate.

The Saints missed two field goals and twice didn't score touchdowns after drives advanced to Atlanta's one-yard line, leaving twice as many points on the field as they posted on the scoreboard. The lone touchdown was a 49-yard interception return by safety Justin Reid in the second quarter, pulling the Saints to wintin 10-7 in a game they never led.

"Defense has got to come up with a second turnover," said edge rusher Cameron Jordan, who posted a sack (No. 126 of his career), two tackles for loss and a forced fumble. "I think the games we've won, we've gotten two turnovers quick and easy and gave the offense another chance. I had a sack-strip-fumble, I've got to get that ball.

Had Jordan recovered the first-quarter fumble, with the Falcons facing third-and-ten from their 45-yard line, New Orleans likely would have taken over inside Atlanta's 40, trailing 3-0.

But the Falcons recovered, maintained possession, punted and forced the Saints punt to end New Orleans' ensuing drive.

And the Saints were 0 for 3 in the red zone - two failed drives that reached the 1 and a missed 38-yard field goal attempt by Blake Grupe on a drive that started at Atlanta's 16, following a 75-yard kickoff return by Mason Tipton.

Grupe also missed a 47-yard attempt - both were wide right - in the second quarter.

"It's not working right now," Grupe said. "All I can do at this point is look at, literally everything. Look into myself, first of all, and go from there. But other than just literally continuing to put the work in week by week and day by day, that's all I can do."

Jordan said he can sympathize with the struggles, but also stressed the expectation.

"I have no idea what it's like to be a kicker," Jordan said. "I've seen kickers go 40-for-40, or whatever, and then...I assume it's a mindset thing. When you

have a great kicker and he starts missing, I've seen it multiple times. I understand there's a mental aspect to it all, one that I can't relate to. I expect them, just like I expect [edge rushers] Chase [Young] or Carl [Granderson] to be able to do their jobs.

"So, when a teammate is in a rut or something, you can't do anything but uplift them. You have to find a way, as a teammate and as a team, to get yourselves out of a hole."

"Beyond that, when you enter the red zone as many times as we did it today, you have to be able to come out with points, preferably touchdowns. When you have a chance on defense to take over the game, you have to be able to. We were playing a good team; I think we showed we are the better team, and we lost. The better team did not win today, and that's on us. We have to be our best friend and not our worst enemy. We stayed getting in our own damn way."

The Saints held Atlanta to 302 yards of offense and the defense produced stops on nine of 12 third down attempts, but New Orleans' own offensive struggles - 293 yards, 5 for 16 on third down and 2 for 5 on fourth down - counterbalanced the effort. The frustration glared most at the goal line.

On the opening drive of the third quarter, the Saints drove 73 yards on 13 plays [aided by defensive pass interference] to reach the Falcons' one-yard line. But on third-and-goal from the two, Taysom Hill took a direct snap and gained one yard on fourth-and-goal from the one, Hill threw an incomplete pass and the deficit remained 16-7 with 7:32 left in the third.

Week 13: Miami Dolphins 21, New Orleans Saints 17; November 30 @ Hard Rock Stadium - As glaringly inefficient as the New Orleans Saints were in the first half of Sunday's game against the Miami Dolphins at Hard Rock Stadium in Miami Gardens, Fla., it is as spectacularly resilient as they were in a stirring second-half comeback that nearly resulted in a victory.

But their 16-0 halftime deficit was just enough to help Miami squeeze out a 21-17 victory over New Orleans, dropping the Saints to 2-10 entering a road game next Sunday against Tampa Bay.

New Orleans' first half included two turnovers [a fumble and an interception by rookie Tyler Shough in his fourth start] and a gashed run defense [112 of Miami's 164 rushing yards] against the Dolphins [5-7], who held the Saints to 63 total yards and one third-down conversion in five attempts in the first 30 minutes.

But the Saints produced one of their best patch jobs of the season in the second half. Shough, who completed seven of 12 passes for 43 yards and was sacked twice in the first half, connected on 19 of 26 passes for 196 yards and two touchdowns in the second half, while the defense didn't allow a touchdown after surrendering one on the opening drive of the game, and limited Miami's offense to 105 yards and a field goal in the final two quarters. "Love the way our guys battled," Saints Head Coach Kellen Moore said. "It was an unfortunate ending, but there's stuff to learn from and grow from during that game, so we'll continue to grow."

New Orleans pulled to within 19-17 on an acrobatic, 15-yard touchdown pass from Shough to Devaughn Vele [eight catches for 93 yards] with 1:17 left, with the six-foot-five receiver leaping high and tapping down each foot before falling out of the back of the end zone.

On the two-point attempt to tie, Shough was intercepted by Miami S Minkah Fitzpatrick who returned it untouched for a Dolphins two-point conversion and 21-17 lead.

Saints K Charlie Smyth, in his first NFL game, then executed a perfect onside kick that Vele recovered at the Saints' 45-yard line, and in two plays New Orleans gained 19 yards to the Miami 36-yard line.

From there, on second-and-1 with 44 seconds left, Shough lofted a pass down the right sideline intended for WR Chris Olave. Olave, escorted by two defenders, made a leaping attempt at the goal line and had the best chance of the triot to make the catch, but saw the ball go through his hands for an incompleteness.

Shough threw incomplete again on third down to avoid a sack and on fourth-and-1, Shough's sneak attempt up the middle was stuffed by the Dolphins. Miami took possession and knelt twice to end it. New Orleans sped up its offensive tempo in the second half, with great benefit.

"I think once we were able to finally get some first downs and get some efficient runs on first and second down and play in some positive yardage situations, the tempo is a byproduct of that and you're able to play with more tempo," Moore said.

It noticeably benefited Shough, whose two turnovers came in the second quarter (Vele said he was to blame for the fumble, for missing a block on the blind side which allowed an undetected Fitzpatrick a strip-sack that was recovered by Miami and returned to the Saints' 37-yard line).

New Orleans held when CB Kool-Aid McKinstry intercepted Tua Tagovailoa in the end zone on the next play.

Miami added a field goal to take a 13-0 lead on its next possession before the Saints drove from their 28 to Miami's 24, where on second-and-10 with 1:14 left, Shough was intercepted by CB Rasul Douglas, who returned it 38 yards to the Saints' 42. The Dolphins added a field goal as time expired in the half to take the 16-point lead.

New Orleans opened the second half with a 10-play, 65-yard touchdown drive that ended on a 17-yard pass to Olave (four catches for 47 yards), and Shough's two-point conversion run halved the deficit to 16-8.

"Just really proud of our resiliency throughout," Shough said. "We started off too slow, just kind of proud how we battled the whole way. It just sucks, losing. We've got to find the little ways to keep getting better. I think we're progressing well, we've got to shore it up."

Defensively, New Orleans posted four sacks including two by edge rusher Cameron Jordan raising his season total to a team-leading 6.5 and his career total to 128, tied with Pro Football Hall of Famer and Saints legend Rickey Jackson for 17th all-time in NFL history.

Week 14: New Orleans Saints 24, Tampa Bay Buccaneers 20; December 7 @ Raymond James Stadium

- As the rain and turf at Raymond James Stadium caked cleats, slicked hands and smeared jerseys, Tyler Shough left the field as pristine as he possibly could have.

The Saints rookie quarterback showed off the goods that made him the team's highest drafted signal-caller since 1971 in a 24-20 victory, his second as a starter.

Shough ran for two touchdowns - including a lead-taking 13-yarder with 8:42 left - and benefited from a herculean defensive effort. New Orleans' defense forced a turnover and produced five fourth-down stops as the Saints won their second road game this season, each over the top two teams (Carolina and Tampa Bay) in the NFC South.

"This is why you play football," Shough said, after helping New Orleans raise its record to 2-3 in his starts. "You come in here, in the elements with all your boys, all your teammates and we fought really hard. I was really proud of the O-line, just kind of chugging along the whole way, they did a really good job in protection.

"The defense was making huge stops. I think we did a better job of being a little bit more complementary, and I'm just proud of all of our guys. It took everybody, so it was just a lot of fun. That's the thing that is kind of resonating with me right now, it was just a lot of fun. And I think this shows kind of how we are as a team."

The Saints again proved to be a markedly better second-half team, outscoring the Buccaneers 17-10, going 5 for 7 on third down after blanking on four first half attempts, gaining 187 of their 260 yards and producing four stops on third down and two on fourth, including the game sealer with 81 seconds left.

"Coming into it, we just knew they were going to be aggressive," said CB Alontae Taylor, whose third quarter interception set the table for Shough's 34-yard touchdown run. "With those fourth-down plays, we were expecting them to go for them."

"I think [def. coord. Brandon] Staley came up with the right gameplan throughout the week. We communicated on the back end and throughout the whole defense, and we were just able to get the stops."

completion on fourth-and-4- with 1:21 left. The Saints limited the Bucs to 301 yards and Tampa Bay quarterback Baker Mayfield completed 14 of 30 passes for 122 yards and a touchdown, with an interception.

"We've only won a couple of games this season, there's a lot of adversity you face," Moore said. "And, so, for our guys to come out and have the energy and physicality they played with, I thought it was a credit to our guys."

"They're a special group, a group that keeps playing and all three phases contributed to this game. It was a really challenging game for both teams. It was big for our guys to come away with the win."

Week 15: New Orleans Saints 20, Carolina Panthers 17; December 14, 2025 @ Caesars Superdome - The

New Orleans Saints hitched to improbable Sunday and wouldn't loosen their grip until they crossed into possible and landed on victory, posting a 20-17 win over Carolina in the Caesars Superdome that riveted as they scored 10 points in the final 2:29.

The Saints [4-10] won their second consecutive games - their first winning streak this season - and evened their record to 3-3 with rookie Tyler Shough starting at quarterback.

Shough [24 of 32 for 272 yards and a touchdown, with no interceptions] threw a 12-yard touchdown pass to receiver Chris Olave with 2:29 left to tie the score at 17-17. After the defense forced a punt, Shough led an eight-play, 62-yard drive that lasted 55 seconds and ended with Charlie Smyth's 47-yard field goal with two seconds left.

"Tyler Shough, he's building," said edge rusher Chase Young, whose nine-yard sack on Carolina's final possession helped force the punt. Young added two tackles for loss and two quarterback hits, but lauded the work of the Saints' rookie quarterback.

"Every week, I can tell he's getting more comfortable," Young said. "He's just starting to look like that guy."

Smyth, too, as assumed the look of a solid NFL kicker. he has made four of his last five kicks [he added a 42-yarder Sunday], and the game-winner was pure.

"We have a great operation," Smyth said. "I never have to think about the ball being in the right spot or with the right hold. It was a cool moment, and one I'll never forget."

Smyth was the Saints' kicker for the third straight game and with the Saints.

His game-winner gave New Orleans its second one-score victory in as many weeks over the NFC South Division leader. Last week, it was a 24-20 road win against Tampa Bay.

Adding to the degree of difficulty against Carolina (7-7), the Saints waded through attrition - RB Devin Neal (hamstring), receiver Devaughn Vele (ankle) and RG Cesar Ruiz (ankle) were lost to injuries during the game - and gutted out a victory that raised their record to 3-2 in the NFC South.

New Orleans battled uphill the entire game; it punted on its opening drive and Carolina followed with a 13-play, 74-yard touchown drive to take a 7-0 lead. The Saints used their first possession of the second quarter to construct a 17-play, 95-yard touch-down drive that lasted 11:22 and ended on Neal's four-yard touchdown run, his second in as many weeks.

But the Panthers nudged ahead on a 40-yard field goal with 21 seconds left in the first half, then expanded the lead to 17-7 when QB Bryce Young threw a 32-yard touchdown pass to Jalen Coker with 9:54 left in the third.

Three consecutive possessions resulted in a fourth-down stop by New Orleans' defense, a fourth-down stop by Carolina's defense, and a forced punt by New Orleans before the frantic finish.



The game-tying drive began at the Saints' 22-yard line with 4:37 left, and Shough completed six of seven passes for 83 yards, including the 12-yard score to Olave with 2:29 left. He connected with Olave, who has game highs of six catches for 85 yards, four times for 63 yards on the drive.

Carolina drove from its 29 to its 43 on its final drive before stalling and punting, with the Saints beginning the game's final drive at their nine-yard line following a holding penalty on the punt return.

Shough completed three passes for 43 yards, spiked the ball to stop the clock with 12 seconds left, then scrambled for four yards and drew a personal foul penalty because he was hit when he started his slide. The 15 yards pushed the Saints from Carolina's 44 to the 29, backup QB Spencer Rattler subbed in for the injured Shough to throw incomplete and sift three seconds off the clock to lower it to six seconds, and Smyth popped the winner on second-and-ten.

"It was huge," Shough said of the victory. "I felt like we had played well on the road but we wanted to show the fans what we could do here, just as a team collectively. Just the resiliency, just a lot of fun. We're just proud of everybody throughout the whole game, especially against a really good team. Two playoff teams, back to back. It was a lot of fun."

Week 16: New Orleans Saints 29, New York Jets 6; December 21, 2025 @ Caesars Superdome - The New Orleans Saints achieved the goal many worthwhile acts aspire to in their regular-season finale Sunday in the Caesars Superdome.

They left the crowd wanting more.

Definitely, more of the 2025 season, which is heading in an upward trajectory that's fostering a hope and expectation that feels familiar. New Orleans (5-10) won its third consecutive game for the first time since 2022, behind a rookie quarterback who has led the team to a 4-3 record in his seven starts, and a defense that continued cresting with eight sacks and two forced turnovers while allowing six points [a season low] and 195 yards in a 29-6 victory over the Jets.

"We've talked a lot about making December football meaningful, and I feel like our guys have been really jumping on that opportunity," Saints Head Coach Kellen Moore said. "Win a few down the stretch here, have a couple more op-

portunities - the energy, the juice, the way our guys are playing together I think is really special. It's a special group in that locker room.

A group that lost 10 of its first 12 games - including three of the first four starts by rookie QB Tyler Shough - found its footing and collected three wins over NFC South division foes Carolina and Tampa Bay, the top two teams in the division, in a five-game stretch.

Sunday's pummeling of the Jets (3-12) was New Orleans' most lopsided decision this season.

It was spurred by five Charlie Smyth field goals; career days from Shough (32 of 49 for 308 yards and a touchdown) and receiver Chris Olave (10 catches for 148 yards and two touchdowns); more history from Taysom Hill, who ran for 42 yards on 12 carries, caught four passes for 36 yards, threw a 38-yard touchdown pass and became the only player in the Super Bowl era to top 1,000 yards passing (2,388), 1,000 yards rushing (2,545) and 1,000 yards receiving (1,002); and the best defensive effort of the season from a unit that has allowed 16 points per game in the last six.

"There was a bunch of guys making plays today," Moore said. "I thought it was a credit to our guys, just the relentless effort, the finish, the way they're playing together. The sacks - there's coverage associated with that, the way our guys are covering on the back end. And guys just took advantage of opportunities. That was really cool to see."

New Orleans overcame a sluggish open. Hill fumbled on the second play from scrimmage after the opening kickoff, and the Jets recovered at the Saints 37-yard line. The defense stiffened after allowing 27 yards on seven plays and forced New York to settle for Nick Folk's 29-yard field goal, the Jets' only lead. The Saints countered with their own field goal drive - 43 yards on 12 plays - to tie the score on a 35-yard field goal by Smyth and after forcing a punt, Smyth capped a 35-yard drive with a 49-yard field goal to give the Saints a 6-3 lead 37 seconds into the second quarter.

The teams exchanged two more field goals in the second quarter and New Orleans held a 9-6 advantage at halftime. But after the Jets sandwiched two punts around a Saints punt to open the third quarter, New Orleans crafted a 12-play, 93-yard touchdown drive that lasted 5:20 and ended on Shough's 23-yard touchdown pass to a wide-open Olave toward the right pylon.

The 16-6 lead essentially was insurmountable when paired with the Saints defense, which added six sacks in the second half and forced both turnovers - a fumble recovery and interception - on consecutive Jets drives in the fourth quarter. Jets rookie quarterback Brady Cook (22 for 35 for 188 yards and an interception, and sacked eight times) bore the brunt of the punishment.

"Went into this game knowing that that this was one of those games we could take advantage on defense," said Saints edge rusher Cam Jordan, the 15-year veteran who had two sacks to raise his season total to a team-leading 8.5 and his career number to 130, extending his franchise record tally. "Just a great defensive outing."

"We have such a talented core. We have such talented veterans. We have a combination, and I'm mad that it took us this long to find some success because you find some success, you understand how to win. And for a while, while we were in a drought, we were trying to figure out why we weren't winning."

Week 17: New Orleans Saints 34, Tennessee Titans 26; December 28, @ Nissan Stadium - Tyler Shough didn't need a magical performance against Tennessee to meet the soaring expectations that have followed him since becoming the Saints starting quarterback.

But in New Orleans a little lagniappe doesn't hurt. Shough helped provide it for Saints fans in Nissan Stadium against the Titans, leading a furious second-half comeback in a 34-26 victory, the fourth straight for New Orleans (6-10) and the fifth win in his eight games as a starter.

New Orleans, which outscored the Titans 24-6 in the second half, hadn't won four consecutive games in a season since winning nine straight in 2020. Shough posted a career-high 333 passing yards and two touchdowns while completing 22 of 27 passes. Audric Esteime ran for a career-high 94 yards, and a 32-yard touchdown, on 18 carries.

Chris Olave caught eight passes to push his season total to 100, a career-high, for 119 yards and a touchdown. Charlie Smyth kicked a career-best 56-yard field goal in the second quarter, then topped it with a 57-yarder in the third.

And the defense held the Titans (3-13) to two second-half field goals, benefitted from four sacks, including 1.5 by edge Chase Young, who returned a strip-sack 33 yards for a touchdown in the second quarter to keep the Saints afloat until the offense found its groove.



"As enjoyable of a win as we've had this year, just from the standpoint of the first half going the way it did - not meeting the standard, having to navigate some stuff in there and then the second half - just the way our guys responded," Saints coach Kellen Moore said.

"It took all three phases. Complementary football at its finest. All three phases contributed really well in that second half and we had some big-time plays by some big-time players."

Nothing less would have sufficed for New Orleans, which trailed 20-10 at halftime as it sputtered offensively (92 yards) and failed to keep Tennessee under wraps on defense (184 yards allowed, 135 of them passing).

But Shough and the offense sprang to life in a second half that was littered with explosive plays: a third-quarter completion of 30 yards (Juwan Johnson); fourth-quarter completion of 32 (Dante Pettis), 39 (Johnson) and 60 (Olave) yards; and a 32-yard touchdown run by Esteime in the fourth quarter to close out the scoring.

"It was our same approach the whole game," said Shough, who completed 12 of 16 passes for 251 yards and both touchdowns in the second half. "We just had to be more dialed. At halftime, Coach Nuss [offensive coordinator Doug Nussmeier], myself, all the guys, we were firing up. Just keep doing what we're doing but find that extra edge, find that extra inch and we can go out there and finish them.

But before the finish there was the mud-stuck start. New Orleans forced a punt on the game's opening drive, but gave up a sack to end its own three-and-out open on offense. The Titans kicked two field goals and scored on a 43-yard touchdown pass by rookie Cam Ward to take a 13-0 lead, and the Saints answered with Smyth's 56-yard field goal before Young injected lift back into the game.

Tennessee drove from its own 24 to the Saints' 46-yard line before a holding penalty pushed the ball back to the Titans' 44. On first-and-20, Ward was pressured by edge Carl Granderson and, in his quest to escape, was sacked from behind by Young. Instead of taking Ward to the ground, Young wrestled the football away and won a 33-yard spring to the end zone, pulling the Saints within 13-10 with 3:51 left in the second quarter.

The Titans scored another touchdown before the half ended, but New Orleans had already found the jolt of adrenaline it needed.

"They chipped me, I went high," said Young, who raised his sack total to a career-high 8.5 this season, with three fumble recoveries. "I owe Grando a couple steak dinners. He pushed the pocket - it doesn't work if we're not together. He went lower, I went high, [Ward] came right to me."

"Mid-play, when I saw him the ball was in the air, and for that split second - my dad used to tell me when I was a kid and I played D-end, 'Take the ball out of his hand' - And for that split second it hit me and I was like the ball is right there, I can take it. I came down on it, and I just took it. And that was all she wrote."

The rest was written by his defense [152 yards allowed and six stops on eight third-down plays in the second half] and offense, which produced 74-, 80- and 64-yard touchdown drives that ended on a 19- and 10-yard touchdown passes to Olave and Kevin Austin Jr., and Estime's run.

Austin and Estime joined the list of unlikely heroes that have surfaced for New Orleans, which continues to produce despite ongoing injury issues.

"I feel like we just don't care," Shough said. "We're here for a reason. We're going to go out there and operate. There's no, 'Oh, man, if we had this.' Let's go out there and play football."

"This is why you do it, and that's kind of my message. Like, what a great opportunity. Next man up, now you get to go make plays. Everybody stepped up."

Week 18: Atlanta Falcons 19, New Orleans Saints 17; January 4, 2026 @ Mercedes-Benz Stadium -



For the first time in more than a month, the New Orleans Saints couldn't outmaneuver the math.

The mixture of a lost fumble, punt blocked, missed 56-yard field goal attempt, an interception and an offensive pass interference penalty in the end zone to negate a touchdown - stirred in with a lengthy list of missing offensive players - provided more hurdles than the Saints could clear in a 19-17 loss to the Falcons in the season finale at Mercedes-Benz Stadium in Atlanta.

But it wasn't because the Saints [6-11] didn't try, and it didn't dampen the prevailing optimism that surrounds the franchise entering the offseason.

While attempting to win their fifth straight game, the Saints stalked the Falcons [8-9] until time and opportunity evaporated on the season, which concluded with New Orleans holding fourth place in the NFC South while Carolina [8-9] claimed the crown. The Saints got another strong, poised performance from their rookie quarterback (Tyler Shough completed 23 of 35 passes for 259 yards and a touchdown, with the interception, and three carries for 34 yards and a touchdown).

And they received the final installment in an eight-game string of stout defensive performances - 49 rushing yards allowed on 25 carries and 208 yards allowed total, 10 tops in 14 third-down attempts, an interception by Carl Granderson, four sacks (Granderson and Chase Young 1.5 each, Cam Jordan one), nine tackles for loss and eight pass breakups. The Saints allowed 15.4 points per game over the final eight as they won five of them, and went 5-4 in games Shough started.

"Our guys battled," Saints first-year Head Coach Kellen Moore said. "I thought the defense played some outstanding football out there, we just weren't able to quite get it done. We were close. A bunch of guys took advantage of some opportunities out there. Overall there's a little bit of reflection in the sense that we're really proud of this group, the way they've stuck together and battled each and every way, all the way down to the very end of this game."

New Orleans never led or tied in the contest, but nipped at the Falcons' heels for all four quarters despite entering the games without its top five receivers, top three running backs, starting left guard and starting center. They also lost LT Kelvin Banks Jr. and jack-of-all-trades Taysom Hill during the game.

The Saints forced a punt on the opening possession (Granderson and Young shared a sack on third down), but the defense soon was back on the field when Juwan Johnson fumbled during a 19-yard catch-and-run, with Atlanta S Xavier Watts recovering and returning it five yards to the Saints' 39-yard line.

The defense responded again; Atlanta drove to the 12 in seven plays, where on first-and-10, Falcons QB Kirk Cousins eyed a screen pass to the right that Granderson detected and made a diving interception of the short throw at the 14.

The team traded punts, then the Falcons blocked Kai Kroeger's punt on fourth-and-8 from the Saints' 13-yard line, with Atlanta recovering at the 5. After a 10-yard penalty and incomplete pass, Cousins connected with Drake London on a 15-yard touchdown for a 7-0 Falcons lead.

Saints Charlie Smyth missed his 56-yard attempt and the Falcons added a field goal in the second quarter before New Orleans constructed a 100-play, 65-yard touchdown drive that ended on Shough's 1-yard run around right end with 4:31 left in the half, pulling the Saints to within 10-7.

The teams swapped field goals in the third quarter, and the Falcons added two more field goals in the fourth - the second, following Shough's interception - to take a 19-10 lead with 2:52 remaining.

Shough then led New Orleans on a seven-play, 65-yard touchdown drive that ended on a 16-yard throw to Ronnie Bell, who made a one-handed, lefthanded catch in the back left of the end zone while his right hand was being held.

That pulled New Orleans to within 19-17 with 71 seconds left, but the Saints had no more timeouts and when Atlanta recovered the onside kick, the Falcons walked away with a season series sweep. Smyth kicked a 29-yard field goal in the third; Shough threw a 1-yard touchdown pass to Kevin Austin on fourth down, but it was nullified when Dante Pettis was flagged for offensive pass interference. Instead of a 14-13 lead, the Saints trailed 13-10.

Still, New Orleans left the field with an even more definitive portrait of its starting quarterback entering the future.

"I love what Tyler has done," Moore said. "His development, his growth, his ability to learn from each and every experience, he's put a ton of good football out there. We're all going to continue to try and improve and get better, collectively as a football team and certainly individually." "I'm excited for what he'll have for this offseason. I think always having a full offseason is a huge benefit for guys just to kind of step away for a second, look at it. You get to watch a ton of film that you get to evaluate and then go from there."

FORMER STANDOUTS DREW BREES AND JAHRI EVANS SELECTED AS FINALISTS FOR PRO FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME'S CLASS OF 2026.

Former New Orleans Saints quarterback Drew Brees and guard Jahri Evans have been selected as two of 15 finalists for the Pro Football Hall of Fame's Class of 2026.

Brees was a two-time AP NFL Offensive Player of the Year, named to 13 Pro Bowls and five AP All-Pro teams and was the 2004 NFL Comeback Player of the Year. Overall, in his 20-year NFL career, he played in 287 regular season games (286 starts) and completed 7,142-of-10,551 passes (67.7 pct.) for 80,358 yards, 571 touchdown passes and a 98.7 passer rating. He set numerous NFL passing records and retired as the league's all-time leader in passing yardage (80,358), completions (7,142) passing attempts (10,551), ranked second in career completion percentage (67.7%) and touchdown passes (571) and fifth in passer rating (98.7).

Brees set marks for touchdown passes in a game [seven, tied with seven other players], completion percentage in a season [74.4, 2018] and in a game [96.7, 12/16/19], completions in a season [471, 2016-broken], 300-yard passing games in a season [13, 2011], consecutive games with at least 300 yards passing [nine, twice], career passing yards [80,358-since broken], passing yards in a four-season span [20,767, 2011-14], in a five-season span [25,637, 2011-15] and in a six-season span [30,845, 2011-16], most seasons leading the league in passing yardage [seven], consecutive games with a touchdown pass [54, 2009-12], games with four-plus touchdown passes [37], four TD passes and zero interceptions [25], games with five-plus TD passes [11] consecutive games with at least three touchdown passes and zero interceptions [four, tied with three other players], overall [10] and consecutive [nine] seasons with at least 30 TD passes, career 300-yard passing games [123] and career 350-yard passing games [63]. The Austin, Texas native retired holding four of the top five most accurate seasons in league history and threw for 5,000 yards an NFL-record five times, a feat no other player has accomplished more than two times.

Brees' record as a starter for the Saints was 151-94 [.616] in the regular season and postseason combined, easily making him the winningest signal-caller in franchise history. Posting a 144-85 [.629] record in the regular season and postseason with Sean Payton as his head coach, the Payton-Brees head coach/starting quarterback combination is tied for second in total wins all-time. Brees retired as the holder of virtually every passing record in club record books with his 15 years of service and 228 regular season starts, both the highest totals in the team's history at the time. From 2006-20, Brees led the NFL with 68,010 passing yards, 491 touchdowns, 8,742 attempts, 6,017 completions, a 68.8 completion percentage, 116 games with at least 300 yards passing, 16 with at least 400 and 518 completions of 25 yards or more.

Evans was originally a fourth round draft pick of the Saints in 2006 out of Bloomsburg and developed into an anchor for one of the most dominant offenses in NFL history during his Saints tenure. The Philadelphia, Pa. native started all 169 regular season games he played in at right guard and all of the team's ten postseason contests during that period.

A five-time AP All-Pro [2009-13], Evans was selected first-team four times, twice as much as any other Saint. Evans was selected to six straight Pro Bowls [2009-14] and was named to the Pro Football Hall of Fame's 2010's All-Decade Team. During his 11-year tenure, the Saints were ranked first in the NFL in total offense six times and in scoring twice. The 274 sacks surrendered by the Saints offensive line from 2006-16 were the lowest total in the NFL over the period and the unit was recognized twice. Evans closed out his playing career starting 14 games at right guard for the Green Bay Packers in 2017, finishing with 183 total games played/started. A Pro Football Hall of Fame semifinalist in 2023 and finalist since 2024, this is his third year as a finalist. Evans began his coaching career for the Saints in 2023 and is currently the team's assistant offensive line coach.

TENTATIVE 2026 NFL DRAFT ORDER

The Saints hold eight picks in the 2026 NFL Draft, including the eighth overall selection. Compensatory picks will be allotted later in the spring.

NEW ORLEANS SAINTS SEASON IN REVIEW

LATE SEASON SURGE

Following a 2-10 start to the 2025 season, as the weather got colder, the Saints got hotter, winning all four contests in the month of December, to set up the team's first four-game winning streak in the same campaign since 2020. This is only the third time in the month of December that the team won all their games, joining the 1987 and 2011 squads. For Head Coach Kellen Moore, he became the second first-year head coach in Saints history to have a winning streak of at least four games.

New Orleans' late season success can be accounted for in improvements in several areas on both offense and defense. Several areas of success are highlighted below, which account for the four-game winning streak:

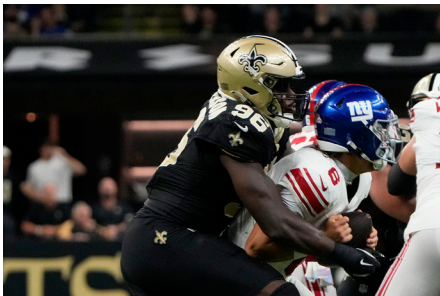

BUCKING THE ODDS

The Saints have a long tradition of finding players as free agents signed after the draft that make an impact immediately or after developing their careers initially on the practice squad. Several undrafted Saints on the roster have played key roles on offense, defense and special teams.

Over the past 22 years, the Saints (2018-22: defensive back **J.T. Gray**, wide receiver/return specialist **Deonte Harty** and wide receiver/return specialist **Rashid Shaheed**) and San Diego/Los Angeles Chargers (2003: guard **Kris Dielman**, tight end **Antonio Gates** and wide receiver **Kasim Osgood**) are the only two teams to have three players signed as undrafted free agents be selected to a Pro Bowl for the team that originally signed them.



Defensive End **Carl Granderson** joined the club in 2019 as an undrafted free agent out of the University of Wyoming and has appeared in 105 games with 47 starts, posting 297 tackles (174 solo), 34.5 sacks for a loss of 208 yards, ten pass breakups, one interception four forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries, one blocked field goal and one blocked extra point.

In 2025, Granderson enjoyed a productive season, recording 57 total tackles (35 solo), six sacks to rank third on the team, one pick, four pass breakups. In three games this season, he recorded more than one sack, playing an important role on a front line of a defense that finished ranked ninth in the NFL in opponent net yards per game and sixth in opponent net yards per play.

Granderson enjoyed a monster performance in the season finale at Atlanta, when he tied a career-high with ten tackles (career-high tying five solo), 1.5 sacks, his first career interception and three stops for loss.

Tight end **Juwan Johnson** first led Saints tight ends with four touchdown receptions in 2021, converting to the position that offseason after playing wideout in college and as a rookie in 2020, after signing as an undrafted free agent from Oregon. Johnson led Saints tight ends with 50 receptions for a club-best 548 yards in 2024, adding three touchdown grabs. He has ranked second on the Saints with 17 receiving touchdowns over the past four seasons, tied for seventh over that period among NFL tight ends. In his career, Johnson has played in 84 games (44 starts), making 223 receptions for 2,511 yards with 21 TDs.

In 2025, Johnson finished ranked fifth among tight ends in receiving and third in receiving yards with a career-high 77 grabs for a career-best 889 yards with three touchdowns. His 219 receptions as a tight end (four additional were as a WR in 2020) are ranked third among the position all-time for the club. His 223 career catches are second among Saints originally signed as an undrafted free agent.

Signing following the 2025 NFL Draft, guard **Torricelli Simpkins III** started all 48 games along the offensive lines at North Carolina Central [2021-23] and South Carolina [2024]. After playing the first three seasons of his career at NCCU, where he was a third-team All-American in 2023, he transferred to USC in 2024. He opened all 13 games at right guard for the Gamecocks and received third-team All-SEC honors. He competed on all three interior positions in training camp and secured a roster spot. The Charlotte, N.C. native received his first career start at left guard at Seattle, Sept. 21, saw extensive action at right guard, at Buffalo, Sept. 28, and started at right guard in the Oct. 5 victory over the New York Giants, where the offensive line did not give up a sack.

Signing following the 2024 NFL Draft, linebacker **Isaiah Stalbird** played at Nebraska [2019] and South Dakota State [2020-23]. He appeared in 64 games in his college career and made 251 tackles, 18.5 for loss, three sacks, an interception, 19 pass break-ups, five forced fumbles, two recoveries and three blocked punts for the 2022 and 2023 FCS National Champions. In 2025, Stalbird had a team-high 19 coverage stops and added 11 defensive tackles, two sacks, to lead the team’s linebacker corps and one pass breakup.

Wide receiver **Mason Tipton** stuck on the 53-man roster in 2024 after showing bright spots in the preseason following a college career at Yale, where he posted 132 receptions for 1,067 yards with 19 touchdowns. In 2024, he had 14 receptions for 99 yards. In the 2025 preseason, Tipton led the team in all receiving categories with eight receptions for 158 yards [19.8 avg.] with one touchdown, ranking fifth in the league in receiving yardage. On Nov. 23, vs. Atlanta, Tipton brought back a kickoff for 75 yards, the longest by the team since the 2020 season. After returning the opening kickoff 54 yards to set up a touchdown on December 7 at Tampa Bay, he has brought back 12 kickoffs for 378 yards [31.5 avg.] to rank fourth in the National Football League among players with at least 11 kickoff returns on the season.

DRAFT RECAP

The New Orleans Saints 2025 draft class, the first under first-year Head Coach Kellen Moore featured seven players contributing to the team’s 53-man roster at the end of the season, three offensive players, as well as three defenders, with four (left tackle Kelvin Banks Jr., cornerback Quincy Riley, safety Jonas Sanker and quarterback Tyler Shough) starting in the regular season finale at the Atlanta Falcons and tight end Moliki Matavao and linebacker Danny Stutsman playing significant snaps. On offense, Executive Vice President/General Manager Mickey Loomis split the selections among four different positions.

Defensively, New Orleans added players at four different positions as the unit makes the switch to Defensive Coordinator Brandon Staley’s 3-4 scheme, a safety, a linebacker and a cornerback currently contributing. With Sanker posting his second interception of the season in the December 21 win against the Jets, for three total takeaways on the season, the most by a Saints rookie since 2021.



The 2025 season saw significant contributions from most of the rookie class. Banks opened all 17 games at one of the NFL’s most challenging positions. Riley played in all 17 games with five starts and recorded 34 tackles, one interception, ten pass breakups and one forced fumble for the NFL’s fourth-ranked pass defense. Sanker played in all 17 games with 16 starts and finished second on the team with 78 stops to go with three takeaways and six pass breakups. Shough started the last eight games of the season and completed 221-of-327 passes (67.6 pct.) for 2,834 yards with ten touchdowns, a 91.3 passer rating and a club-best three rushing touchdowns. Despite being placed on Injured Reserve for the final three games of the season, RB Devin Neal ranked second on the team with 206 rushing yards and two rushing touchdowns.

Kelvin Banks Jr. was selected with the ninth overall pick out of Texas this past April, the highest selection by the Black and Gold since 2005. A three-year starter who

opened all 42 games he played in at left tackle for the Longhorns from 2022-24, Banks was the 2024 Outland Trophy winner and a unanimous All-American selection. In his first season, Banks has lined up at the position that he manned flawlessly as a college standout, facing weekly challenges from some of the NFL’s elite pass rushers. He was a consensus All-Rookie selection and was the only Saints offensive lineman to open every contest. Surrendering only four sacks, when often left on an island, for rookie tackles who started at least 16 of their team’s contests, Banks gave up the fewest takedowns.

The Saints selected **Tyler Shough** out of Louisville with the team’s selection in the second round [40th overall] of the 2025 NFL Draft. In seven seasons at Oregon [2018-20], Texas Tech [2021-23] and Louisville [2024], Shough played in 42 games and completed 599-of-951 passes [63.0 pct.] for 7,820 yards with 59 touchdowns, also carrying 246 times for 733 yards with 11 scores.

In 11 games with nine starts, Shough completed 221-of-327 passes [67.6 pct.-third all-time among qualifying NFL rookies] for 2,384 yards with ten touchdowns, six interceptions and a 91.3 passer rating, also carrying 47 times for 186 yards with a team-leading touchdowns and an additional two-point conversion rush. Among qualifying passers, he ranked first in the NFL in third down passer rating [103.3]. Setting every rookie passing record in team history, Shough has snuck up on the competition as a consensus all-rookie selection and finalist for AP NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year honors. Posting a 5-4 record as the team’s starter, the Chandler, Ariz. native led all rookie signal-callers in victories, as well as several other categories.

For the period of the last five games of the season, Shough earned NFL Offensive Rookie of the Month honors, when he led the Black and Gold to a 4-1 record, including a four-game winning streak with three fourth quarter game-winning drives. During the period he completed 114-of-163 passes [69.9 pct.] for 1,316 yards with five touchdowns, two interceptions and a 99.1 passer rating [111.6 on third down] over the final month of the regular season. Shough also rushed 24 times for 135 yards with three touchdowns during the stretch.

The Saints selected **Vernon Broughton** out of Texas with the team’s first selection in the third round (71st overall) of the 2025 NFL Draft. The Houston, Texas native spent five seasons with the Longhorns, seeing action in 56 career games with 18 starts and was credited with 70 tackles [39 solo], 10.5 stops for loss, 6.5 sacks for loss of 40 yards, 15 quarterback hits, four fumble recoveries, three pass breakups and two forced fumbles. In 2024, he was a mainstay on the Texas defensive front, in 16 games logging 39 tackles [24 solo], 4.5 stops for loss, four sacks, two pass breakups, two forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries. After recording three tackles in the team’s Week Two contest vs. San Francisco, Broughton was sidelined for the remainder of the season with a hip injury, but will be recovered to compete for snaps on the interior in the 2026 offseason.



Twice named a first-team All-Atlantic Coast Conference selection at safety, **Jonas Sanker**, the team’s second third round pick was counted on to lead the Virginia secondary in his last three college seasons. Known as a rangy and versatile safety, he totaled 273 career tackles [176 solo], 13 stops for loss, two sacks for six-yard loss, four forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries with one returned 40 yards for a touchdown, two interceptions, 17 pass breakups, 19 passes defended, one special teams fumble recovery and one blocked field goal.

Taking over starting free safety duties in Week Two, Sanker ranked among rookie leaders in interceptions, takeaways and tackles with 78 stops [46 solo], two interceptions, one fumble recovery and six pass breakups.

The first of two fourth round draft picks by the Saints, LB **Danny Stutsman** played in 47 career contests, starting 37, with all coming over the last three seasons at Oklahoma. The Central Florida native accumulated 376 tackles over his four-year career with 183 solo stops, 36 stops for loss, eight sacks, three interception returns for 70 yards, eight pass breakups, 11 passes defended, four forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. Stutsman was a first-team All-American for the Sooners in 2024, when he started all 12 games he played in and made 109 stops, eight tackles for loss and one sack.

SAINTS 2025 DRAFT RECAP [CONT.]

In 2025, Stutsman played an active role on the team’s special teams units, where he finished third on the club with 13 stops and the club also inserted him into defensive packages, where he made 40 tackles.



The second of two fourth round picks by the Black and Gold, CB **Quincy Riley** finished his college career playing in 55 games with 36 starts in six seasons with Louisville [2022-24] and Middle Tennessee [2019-21], posting 159 tackles, ten stops for loss, 2.5 sacks, 15 interceptions, including two returned for touchdowns, 59 passes defended and a forced fumble. In 2024 when he was a teammate of Shough, Riley appeared in ten games with eight starts for the Cardinals and finished with 33 tackles [21 solo], one forced fumble and three stops for loss. Tied for the team lead with two interceptions and tied for ninth in the nation with 15 pass breakups [17 passes defended], earning second-team All-Atlantic Coast Conference honors.

After competing in training camp for a role in the team’s defensive packages, Riley’s combination of competitiveness and speed propelled him as has he moved into the starting lineup the team’s three-cornerback rotation in Week Three, and for the the season, when he played in all 17 games with five starts in the team’s base defense and recorded 30 tackles, an interception in Week Seven at Chicago, ten pass breakups, one forced fumble and one coverage stop, earning ESPN and CBS Sports All-Rookie honors.

Riley finished the season tied for fourth in the National Football League among rookies with ten pass breakups.

The team’s sixth round draft pick out of Kansas, **Devin Neal** put together an impressive college career that included three consecutive 1,000-yard seasons as he finished as the Jayhawks’ all-time leading roster. Neal played in 50 games for the Jayhawks, rushing 760 times for 4,343 yards [5.7 avg.] with 49 touchdowns and had 77 catches for 711 yards with four touchdowns. In addition to being the school’s all-time leading rusher, he also holds the KU school record for rushing touchdowns [49], scrimmage touchdowns [53] and 100+ yard rushing games [20].

Neal was selected by the Black and Gold on the strength of his final campaign in Lawrence, where he was an honorable mention All-Big 12 selection, rushing for 1,266 yards on 219 attempts [5.8 avg.] and 16 touchdowns, while catching 24 passes for 254 yards with one touchdown.

After competing for carries in the preseason, Neal emerged as New Orleans’ top backup behind Alvin Kamara, appearing in ten games with three starts and rushing for 206 yards and catching 17 passes for 104 yards. In his second career start on December 7 at Tampa Bay, Neal rushed for 70 yards, with his first career touchdown in the fourth quarter and added to his total with a 14-yard reception on third down in the second half to keep a drive alive. In the December 14 win over Carolina, before departing with a hamstring injury, Neal scored a rushing touchdown for the second consecutive week.



The first of two seventh round draft picks by the Saints, TE **Moliki Matavao** played four seasons at Oregon [2021-22] and UCLA [2023-24], where he started 22-of-50 games and logged 74 receptions for 998 yards [13.5 avg.] and six scores. In 11 games with eight starts in 2024, the Henderson, Nev. native caught 41 passes for 506 yards and two touchdowns for the Bruins. Matavao ended up on the active roster for six games with two starts and contributed on both offense and special teams, recording two receptions for ten yards.

The second of two seventh round picks by the Black and Gold, DE **Fadil Diggs** finished his college career playing in 45 games with 32 starts in five seasons with Texas A&M

[2020-23] and Syracuse [2024], posting 120 tackles [65 solo], 32.5 stops for loss, 15.5 sacks, three passes defended, four forced fumbles and a fumble recovery. In 2024, Diggs was an honorable mention All-ACC selection, when he started all 12 games and led the Orange in stops for loss [14] and sacks [7.5], adding 45 tackles, three quarterback hurries, one forced fumble, one recovery and one pass breakup.

After competing on defense and special teams in training camp, Diggs contributed in both areas in five games for the Saints as a rookie and will continue to build up this offseason and compete for more extensive snaps in 2026 training camp and the preseason.

FROM THE FIELD TO THE SIDELINE

Kellen Moore was the seventh New Orleans Saints head coach to have played in the National Football League, joining Tom Fears, John North, Dick Nolan, Mike Ditka, Jim Haslett and Sean Payton. Moore, who finished his college playing career at Boise State with a record of 50-3, the most wins by a quarterback in NCAA history, played six seasons for the Detroit Lions [2012-14] and Dallas Cowboys [2015-17].



BARKING UP THE RIGHT TREE

With Moore as his offensive coordinator in 2024 with the Eagles, Philadelphia running back Saquon Barkley had one of the best seasons by a tailback in NFL history. The consensus National Football League Offensive Player of the Year, a first-team Associated Press All-Pro and Pro Bowl starter selection, Barkley led the league with a franchise-record 2,005 rushing yards in the regular season, making him just the ninth player in NFL history to post 2,000+ rushing yards in a season, eight-most in league records. Including 499 rushing yards in the playoffs which ranked third all-time, Barkley's 2,504 rushing yards were the most in NFL single-season history (regular season and postseason combined).

NOTHING HURTS

In 2024 in Philadelphia, under the tutelage of Moore who served as offensive coordinator and Saints Offensive Coordinator Doug Nussmeier, who was quarterbacks coach, Eagles signal-caller Jalen Hurts was able to put together one of the best seasons of his career. The Super Bowl Most Valuable Player ranked among the top eight in the league in yards per attempt (fourth, 8.0), passer rating (fifth, career-high 103.7), completion percentage (eight, career-high 6.7 pct.) and total touchdowns (32, eighth). In Super Bowl LIX, Hurts completed 17-of-22 passes (77.3 pct.) for 221 yards, two touchdowns, a 119.7 passer rating and 72 rushing yards with one touchdown on the ground, the most rushing yards by a signal-caller ever in a Super Bowl.

In the October 26 contest against the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, the Saints succeeded in a pair of short yardage situations against tall odds, putting the heart they have shown all season on full display in a valiant effort.

In the second quarter, with the Buccaneers having first and one at the Saints’ one-yard line, the New Orleans front seven stopped Buccaneers RB Ra-chaad White from entering the end zone on three straight plays, with DE Chris Rumph II and DT Nathan Shepherd stuffing Tampa Bay RB Sean Tucker on fourth-and-one.



In Tampa Bay’s first drive of the third quarter, the Buccaneers advanced to the New Orleans one-yard line following a 22-yard completion from QB Baker Mayfield to tight end Cade Otton. On a pair of goal line plays, CB Kool-Aid McKinstry successfully defended Mayfield pass attempts to wideouts Sterling Shepard and Emeka Egbuka. On second down, LB Demario Davis stuffed Tucker.

Until Tucker reached the end zone on fourth and one, the Saints had successfully defended the one-yard line seven times in the contest, the first time a team had done so since the December 8, 2013 matchup where Tennessee Titans managed seven stops from the one-yard line by the Denver Broncos at Empower Field at Mile High [credit-ESPN].

With edge defenders Cameron Jordan [10.5] and Chase Young [10] each reaching double-digit sacks for the season, the Saints were only one of three NFL teams in 2025 to have two defenders with at least ten sacks each. Jordan and Young joined the Houston Texans' Will Anderson Jr. and Danielle Hunter and the Detroit Lions' Aidan Hutchinson and Al Quadin Muhammad as the league's three double-digit sack duos from the same team. 2025 marks the ninth time and first since 2013 that two Saints have reached double-digit quarterback takedowns.



YOUTH IS SERVED

In 2025, the Saints enjoyed success against rookie quarterbacks, having won all three matchups against first-year signal-callers. Below are the results New Orleans has produced in these contests:

Giants QB Jaxson Dart - Dart completed 26-of-40 passes for 202 yards with two touchdowns, was intercepted twice by CB Kool-Aid McKinstry, fumbled once (recovered by DE Cameron Jordan) and sacked once, for a 73.1 passer rating.

Jets QB Brady Cook - Completed 22-of-35 passes for 188 yards with one interception by S Jonas Sanker, sacked eight times, including for a strip sack by DE Nathan Shepherd, recovered by DE Chase Young, for a 64.9 passer rating.



Saints 34, Titans 26

Titans QB Cam Ward - In a matchup between two of the most promising young quarterbacks in the NFL of New Orleans' Tyler Shough and Ward, the New Orleans defense harassed. Ward, allowing him to complete only 21-of-40 passes (52.5 pct.) and sacked him four times, including a strip sack by DE Chase Young returned 33 yards for a touchdown.



PICK ME UP

The 2025 Saints were tied for fourth in the NFL with ten fumble recoveries, one of nine teams in double digits, powered by the two former Ohio State teammates in Young and LB Pete Werner tied for the league lead with two other players with three apiece.

2024 DRAFT CONTRIBUTORS

The team’s top three selections in the 2024 NFL Draft started multiple games for the Saints in 2024. Below is a summary of the performance of five of the top six 2024 draft picks, as each of them made a jump in 2025:

Right Tackle Taliese Fuaga, Oregon State [D1] - Selected with the 14th overall pick out of Oregon State, the Saints were able to address an immediate need, while also acquiring a building block for the future. Fuaga was an anchor on the Saints offensive line in his rookie campaign, seamlessly moving over to the left tackle position for his first NFL season, where he opened every game for an offense that improved in every rushing metric. Starting all 17 games, he was the first Saint to start every game in his rookie year at the offensive line’s most challenging position since J.T. Taylor in 1978. Now in 2025, Fuaga has moved back to his natural right tackle position, starting 13 games as a book-end to left tackle Kelvin Banks Jr., as the duo serve as building blocks for the New Orleans front line moving forward.



Cornerback Kool-Aid McKinstry, Alabama [D2] - Selected in the second round of the 2024 NFL Draft with the 41st overall pick out of Alabama, McK-instry arrived in New Orleans having covered many of the nation’s top wideouts in the Southeastern Conference for three years. In 2023, the consensus first-team All-American was a semifinalist for the Jim Thorpe Award in his final college campaign, making 32 tackles and seven passes defended.

Opening every contest in his second season in 2025, he recorded 76 tackles (59 solo) with, three interceptions and a club-best 17 pass breakups, tied for sixth in the NFL and third in the NFC. The Pin-son, Ala. native recorded the first two picks of his career in the Oct. 5 win over the New York Giants, capturing NFC Defensive Player of the Week honors for the first time in his career. In 32 career games with 26 starts, he has career totals of 117 stops (90 solo), three picks, 24 pass breakups and one special teams tackle.

NEW ORLEANS SAINTS SEASON IN REVIEW

QB Spencer Rattler, South Carolina [D5a] - Selected with the team's first selection in the fifth round [150th overall] out of South Carolina, Rattler completed 900-of-1,313 passes [68.5 pct.] for 10,807 yards with 77 touchdowns, and only 32 interceptions for the Gamecocks [2022-23] and Oklahoma [2019-21].

As a rookie in 2024, Rattler appeared in seven games with six starts, he completed 130-of-228 passes for a Saints rookie-record 1,317 yards with four touchdowns, also carrying 18 times for 146 yards. In 2025 in nine games with eight starts, Rattler completed 173-of-257 passes [67.3 pct.] for 1,586 yards with eight touchdowns, five interceptions and an 86.8 passer rating. Rattler utilized his feet well, carrying 31 times for 167 yards [5.4 avg.].



LB Jaylan Ford, Texas [D5c] - The last of three fifth round draft picks by the club in 2024, Ford was selected out of Texas, where during he posted 287 tackles, 27.5 stops for loss, three sacks, ten pass breakups, six interceptions, four forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries. As a rookie, Ford established a role on special teams, contributing five tackles before suffering a fibula injury in Week 17. In 2025, he had nine coverage tackles and two defensive stops.



DT Khristian Boyd, Northern Iowa [D6] - A sixth round selection, Boyd appeared in 49 career games in college and collected 149 tackles [59 solo], 22.5 stops for loss, 10.5 sacks, five pass breakups and two forced fumbles.



In his final college season, Boyd started all 11 games along and had 43 stops, 6.5 tackles for loss, 3.5 sacks and a pass breakup, while earning All-MVFC first-team and consensus FCS third-team All-American. Following a full offseason, and utilizing his 6-2, 320-pound frame to fit into the Saints' 3-4 alignment, the Kansas City native led the Black and Gold with two sacks in the preseason, providing a push up the team's interior defensive line. Boyd had four stops in three games. He saw his most significant action in the season finale, when saw action on first and second downs and short yardage as part of a standout run stopping effort, where the Falcons managed only 49 yards on 25 carries.

SPECIAL TEAMS OVERVIEW

Saints special teams benefited from the elevation of Phil Galiano to coordinator, after serving as assistant special teams coach for five-and-a-half seasons before taking over coordination of the unit midway through the 2024 season. During Galiano's tenure, the special teams units have consistently ranked among the NFL's leaders in placekicking, coverage and return units, producing Pro Bowlers and Associated Press All-Pros, while also setting various club records in placekicking, punting, return game and coverage units. Under Galiano's direction, the club has committed to a transition of a mix of seasoned veterans and several promising youngsters.

BLOCK UNIT

New Orleans’ field goal block unit came through big on three occasions in the second half of the 2024 season, two taking place in three-point victories. The field goal block unit’s hard work carried over into the 2025 season opener, as third-year defensive tackle **Bryan Bresee** blocked a fourth quarter 46-yard field goal attempt to give the offense the ball back for a drive where they ended up scoring a field goal.



In the third quarter of New Orleans’ November 9 win at Carolina, narrowly holding onto a 10-7 third quarter lead, DT **Nathan Shepherd** blocked a 48-yard field goal attempt. For his efforts, Shepherd was named the Week Ten NFC Special Teams Player of the Week.



COVERAGE UNITS

Galiano and Assistant Special Teams Coach Kyle Wilber were tasked with remaking the coverage aspect of the special teams units with the top Six tacklers from the 2024 campaign not on the roster. Second-year LB Isaiah Stalbird led the team with 16 stops.

Signing following the 2024 NFL Draft, Stalbird played in five games and recorded three special teams tackles. In 2025, he played in all 17 contests and buoyed the coverage units with a club-best 16 stops, while also leading the linebackers with two sacks.

Signed by New Orleans following the NFL Draft, Rumph provided depth at the edge position and knowledge of Defensive Coordinator Brandon Staley’s system from their time together with the Los Angeles Chargers. He developed into a core special teams player for the Black and Gold and added 14 stops.

The second of the team’s two fourth round picks, Stutsman immediately assumed a significant role on special teams, as well as seeing action on defensive packages, finishing third on the Saints with 13 coverage stops.

Yiadom is an eight-year NFL veteran who returned to New Orleans in the offseason, having spent the 2022 and 2023 campaigns with the Black and Gold, split by the 2024 season in San Francisco. In 2025, he added a career-high ten coverage stops to his career total that is now 36.

K CHARLIE SMYTH

Signed by New Orleans in the 2024 offseason as part of the National Football League’s International Player Pathway program, this Newry, Ireland native spent his entire rookie campaign and the first 12 weeks of 2025 on the practice squad. The former Gaelic football player made his NFL debut on Nov. 30 at Miami and drilled a 56-yard field goal attempt. He also successfully executed an onside kick recovered by teammate Devaughn Vele, part of a play that has a 7.75% success rate since new league kickoff rules being instituted in 2018.



Smyth’s 56-yard field goal was tied for the second-longest field goal by an NFL player on their first career attempt.

In six appearances for the Black and Gold, Smyth drilled 12-of-16 field goal attempts (75.0 pct.), including four-of-six on 50+-yard attempts, made all 13 PAT attempts for 49 total points and also had 16 touchbacks on kickoffs Smyth is the only Saints kicker to drill three kicks of 56 yards or more in the same season.

GAME WINNER

On Dec. 14, vs. Carolina, Smyth made both of his PAT attempts, a 42-yard field goal and a 47-yard game-winning field goal with two seconds remaining to help carry the Black and Gold to a 20-17 victory. Smyth’s kick was the first game-winner (within two minutes of end of regulation or in overtime) by the Saints since a 51-yard kick by Wil Lutz in the 2022 opener at Atlanta in a 27-26 Saints victory.

I GOT FIVE ON IT

In the Dec. 21 29-6 win over the New York Jets, Smyth provided 17 of New Orleans’ season-high point total, tying a club record by drilling five field goals, including a 50-yard kick, to go with two PATs. This is the tenth game a Saint has kicked five field goals. Five of the occurrences are by foreign-born Saints with Smyth joining Pro Football Hall of Fame kicker and Denmark native Morten Andersen, who reached five field goals four times as a Saint.

In the December 28, 34-26 victory at the Tennessee Titans, Smyth drilled 56- and 57-yard field goals to go with three PAT attempts and six touchbacks on kickoffs. Combined with a 56-yard field goal in his NFL debut at Miami on November 30, Smyth's three field goals in 2025 of 56 yards or more make him the first Saint to do so.



QUARTERBACKS

TYLER SHOUGH

In 11 games with nine starts after opening his first contest on November 2, Tyler Shough, the team's second round draft pick out of Louisville, completed 221-of-327 passes (67.6 pct.) for 2,384 yards with ten touchdowns, only six interceptions and a 91.3 passer rating, also carrying 45 times for 186 yards with a club-best three touchdowns and an additional two-point conversion rush. A consensus All-Rookie selection and one of five finalists for the Associated Press NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year honors, Shough ended up leading rookie signal-callers in wins (five), third down passer rating (third-best 103.3), completion percentage, 300-yard passing games (two) and fourth quarter game-winning drives (three)



SHOUGH'S FIRST NINE

After throwing for 2,256 yards through his first nine starts, Shough's passing yardage total ranked third among a Saints signal-caller for their first nine starts with the club.

GAME-WINNERS



In the clutch, Shough become the first Saint since 2020 to lead the Black and Gold to two straight fourth quarter/overtime game-winning drives, the first Saint to do so since Drew Brees in 2020, including leading the team from a 17-10 fourth quarter deficit in the December 14, 20-17 victory over Carolina.

In New Orleans’ Dec. 28 win at Tennessee, Shough had his third of the season, with the Saints trailing 26-20 in the fourth quarter. Shough overcame a lost fumble by the Saints on their first drive of the final period. Following the fumble, Shough took advantage of the defense quickly getting the ball back and went to work with 8:45 left. Following a 12 yard carry by RB Audric Esteime, Shough completed a pass for a 60-yard gain to WR Chris Olave to the Titans eight-yard line. On second down, the rookie signal-caller and WR Kevin Austin Jr. connected in the end zone for a ten-yard TD to complete New Orleans’ comeback. Despite only playing in 11 games with nine starts, Shough’s three fourth quarter game-winning drives led all rookies and were the most by a Saint since Brees’ three in 2020.

HERE FOR SECONDS

In his second career start at Carolina on Nov. 9, Shough completed 19-of-27 passes for a then Saints rookie-record 282 yards with two touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 128.9 passer rating. His first TD pass was a 62-yard laser to WR Chris Olave, which was the second-longest touchdown thrown by a Saints rookie QB, with Archie Manning throwing a 63-yarder to WR Danny Abramowicz on Oct. 3, 1971 against the Houston Oilers. With the victory, Shough became the first Saints rookie signal-caller to win a start since Dave Wilson [at L.A. Rams, 11/8/81]. Overall he became the fourth Saints rookie to win a start, joining Wilson, Manning [1971] and Larry Cipa [1974].

The last time a Saints quarterback had 2+ touch-down passes and zero interceptions in one of his first two career starts was Manning [9/26/71 @San Francisco].

RUN FOR IT

In the December 7, 24-20 win at Tampa Bay, Shough achieved several firsts in using both his arm and legs to help power New Orleans’ 24-20 win over the Buccaneers. Shough completed 13-of-20 passes [65.0 pct.] for 144 yards, with a career day on the ground in driving rain, carrying seven times for 55 yards [7.9 avg.] with two touchdowns. Shough’s two scores were the first time a Saints rookie had two rushing TDs since Archie Manning [vs. Dallas on 10/17/71] and his 55 yards rushing are the most in franchise history by a rookie signal-caller. Shough executed the first fourth quarter game winning drive of his career, when with the score tied 17-17, he drove New Orleans down the field 53-yards on nine plays, ending with a 13-yard rushing touchdown. In addition to the rushing touchdown, Shough completed three-of-four passes for 36 yards on the game-winning drive.

BACK TO BACK I

On Dec. 14, vs. Carolina Shough engineered an eight-play, 62-yard drive that took 55 seconds, ending with a 47-yard field goal by K Charlie Smyth. In it, he completed three-of-four passes for 43 yards and also gained four yards on a rush to help lead the Saints to the 20-17 win. In the fourth quarter alone, Shough completed 13-of-18 passes for 162 yards with the game-tying 12-yard touchdown pass to WR Chris Olave, as well as grinding out four yards rushing, for the second-highest fourth quarter passing yardage total in Week 15 in the NFL. With Shough’s fourth quarter game-winning drive at Tampa Bay the prior week, it is the first time a Saints signal-caller has had fourth quarter/overtime game-winning drives in consecutive contests since Drew Brees in Weeks Five (team had bye in Week Six), Seven and Eight of the 2020 season. Shough and Jayden Daniels (2024) are the only rookie quarterbacks in the last ten seasons to lead a game-winning drive in back-to-back games against a team with a winning record.



BACK TO BACK II

In the Dec. 21, 29-6 win over the Jets, Shough went 32-49 for a career-high 308 yards with a touchdown, and zero interceptions. He also rushed for eight yards on two attempts. It marked the first time a Saints rookie signal-caller threw for 300 yards and only the second time an NFL rookie threw for 300 in 2025. Following the Jets contest, Shough No. 1 in completions [176], passing yards [1,792], passing touchdowns [7], passer rating [86.5] and completion percentage [66.4 pct.] among the 11 qualifying rookie quarterbacks in franchise history.



In the Dec. 28, 34-26 win over the Titans, Shough finished 22-of-27 [81.5 pct.] for 333 yards with a touchdown, zero interceptions and a 142.4 passer rating, setting career-highs in completion percentage, passing yardage, passer rating and yards per attempt [12.33], leading New Orleans to their third undefeated December in franchise history.

After throwing for 308 yards the week before against the Jets, combined with the 333-yard passing performance, Shough is the first quarterback to have back-to-back passing games since the Houston Texans' C.J. Stroud, who did so in four consecutive games [11/5-11/16/23], that season's NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year. Looking towards Sunday's regular season finale at Atlanta, the last time a Saints signal-caller threw for at least three 300 yards in three consecutive games was Drew Brees, for a five games stretch spanning both the 2015 and 2016 seasons [12/13/15-9/11/16].

With Shough's back-to-back performances of 300+ yards and zero interceptions, he joins Cincinnati's Joe Burrow [9/17-9/27/20] and Dallas's Dak Prescott [11/13-11/20/16] as only the third rookie quarterback to do so since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger. If Shough manages 300 yards passing and zero interceptions in Sunday's season finale at Atlanta, he would be the first rookie signal-caller to do so in three straight games.

TAYSOM HILL

Hill has brought unheralded versatility to the Saints offense and special teams. He's played in 118 games with 5 starts at several positions. He has carried 489 times for 2,551 yards, the most by a Saint not to play running back full-time, with 34 touchdowns, ranked fifth in club records. In the passing game, he has caught 110 passes for 1,034 yards with 11 touchdowns, completed 195-of-308 passes for 2,426 yards with 12 touchdowns, returned 20 kicks for 489 yards, made one defensive tackle, a forced fumble, 18 special teams tackles and blocked one punt.

After suffering a season-ending knee injury in Week 13 of the 2024 season, Hill aggressively rehabbed to return to action in Week Four. On Oct. 12, vs. the New England Patriots, Hill scored his first rushing touchdown of 2025 on a one-yard run. He rushed for 114 yards with one touchdown, caught 11 passes for 91 yards, completed two passes for 57 yards with a 38-yard TD and had two special teams stops. Hill was voted by his teammates as the 2025 Ed Block Courage Award Saints team winner.

With the team suffering attrition at the running back position, Hill had a career-high 16 touches in the December 21 win over the New York Jets, finishing with 78 yards from scrimmage on a team-best 42 yards rushing and four receptions for 36 yards. Hill saved his best for last on the team's final possession, when he completed a 38-yard laser to WR Chris Olave in the end zone. Following the conclusion of the season, Hill now has 2,551 rushing yards, 2,426 passing yards and 1,034 receiving yards, becoming the only player with 1,000 pass yards, 1,000 rushing yards and 1,000 receiving yards in the Super Bowl Era.

1 - With 2,551 rushing yards, 2,426 passing yards and 1,034 receiving yards, Hill is the only NFL player in the Super Bowl era with 2,000 career passing yards, 2,500 career rushing yards and 1,000 career receiving yards.

35 - With a 38-yard touchdown pass, 42 rushing yards and 36 receiving yards in the Saints' 29-6 victory over the New York Jets on Dec. 21, Hill joined Christian McCaffrey [Dec. 17, 2018], as the only players since 1990 with at least 35 passing yards, 35 rushing yards and 35 receiving yards in a single game.

45 - Hill has 45 career touchdowns [rushing and receiving combined], ranked ninth in club record books.

116 - Hill has appeared in 118 career regular season games during his nine-year career, tied for 36th in club record books with S Brett Maxie and DE Charles Grant.

575 - Hill's 575 rushing yards in 2022 was the highest rushing yardage total by a Saint whose primary position is not running back. In fact, Hill has the five biggest single-season non-running back rushing yardage totals.

6,500 - Hill has accounted a total of 6,500 total yards in his nine-year National Football League career [2,426 passing, 1,034 receiving, 2,551 rushing and 489 kickoff returns].

RUNNING BACKS

ALVIN KAMARA



A talented runner and receiver who was selected by the Saints in the third round of the 2017 NFL Draft out of University of Tennessee, in 126 career games with 95 starts, Alvin Kamara has carried 1,675 times for 7,250 yards [4.3 avg.] with 61 touchdowns and has caught 606 passes [ranked sixth all-time among running backs] for 4,948 yards [8.2 avg.] with 25 touchdowns. Kamara is the franchise's all-time leader in rushing yards, rushing touchdowns, total touchdowns [87], two-point conversions [7], total yards from scrimmage [12,198], all-purpose yardage [12,862] and first downs [601]. In seven postseason games with four starts, he has rushed for 357 yards with three touchdowns, caught 33 receptions 274 yards and one touchdown and returned eight kickoffs for 214 yards for 845 all-purpose yards.

In 2025, in 11 games/starts, Kamara led the team in rushing for the eighth consecutive season and overall campaign, with 471 yards, despite missing the last six games of the season with a knee injury, with one touchdown and also caught 33 passes for 186 yards for 657 total yards from scrimmage.

Since entering the NFL in 2017, Saints running back Kamara ranks third in the league in yards from scrimmage [12,198], only one of three to have 12,000 over that period. With 1,493 scrimmage yards in 2024, Kamara was the third player since 2000 with at least 1,100 scrimmage yards in each of his first eight seasons, joining Matt Forte and Pro Football Hall of Famer LaDainian Tomlinson.

AUDRIC ESTIME

A fifth round selection of the Denver Broncos in 2024 out of Notre Dame, where he has carried 210 times for 1,341 yards [6.4 avg.] with 18 touchdowns in 2023, the New Jersey native played in 13 games with one start as a rookie and carried 76 times for 310 yards [4.1 avg.] with two touchdowns. After spending the start of the 2025 season on the Eagles practice squad, Estime joined the Saints practice roster in late October and was signed to the active roster in Week 11. In seven games with one start, Estime rushed 46 times for 198 yards [4.3 avg.] with a 32-yard TD and caught 12 passes for 103 yards [8.6 avg.].

WIDE RECEIVERS

CHRIS OLAVE

The 11th overall pick in the 2022 NFL Draft out of Ohio State, this talented wideout made an immediate impact as a rookie, catching 72 passes for 1,042 yards [14.5 avg.] and four touchdowns, leading the team in receptions, receiving average and receiving yards, while earning September National Football League Offensive Rookie of the Month honors as the 24th player since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger to record 1,000 receiving yards as a rookie. Olave became the third Saints rookie to reach 1,000 receiving yards and the first Saints rookie since WR Danny Abramowicz [1967] to lead the team in receiving, receiving yardage and yards per catch in his first campaign.

In 2023, Olave took the next step in his promising-career, leading the team in receiving and receiving yardage for the second consecutive season with 87 receptions for 1,123 yards and five TDs, tying for the team lead. He became the seventh Saint with 85 receptions in a season and the sixth with 1,100 receiving yards in a season.

In 2024, prior to being placed on Injured Reserve in Week Ten [concussion], he led the team’s wideout corps in receiving with 32 grabs for a club-best 400 yards with one touchdown in eight games. Olave rebounded to appear in 16 contests, while leading the team in receiving in 2025 with a career-high 100 receptions for 1,163 yards with a career-high nine touchdowns. Olave finished the season ranked seventh in the NFL in receiving, eighth in receiving yards and third in third down receptions [30] after he reached the end zone for his career-high ninth scoring grab of the season on Dec. 28 in Tennessee.

100 CLUB



In the December 28 34-26 win over Tennessee, he enjoyed a career performance in powering the passing offense to victory. Olave finished with eight catches for 119 yards with one touchdown, as well as a grab for a 60-yard gain that was his 100th catch of the season. With the grab, he joined Michael Thomas as only the second Saint to reach the century mark. In reaching the 1,100-yard mark for the second time in his career, Olave joins Joe Horn and Michael Thomas [four], Marques Colston [three] and Jimmy Graham [two] to become only the fifth Saint to have multiple 1,100-yard receiving seasons.

DEVAUGHN VELE

This second-year wideout was acquired by the Saints from Denver near the conclusion of the pre-season. A seventh round pick of Denver out of Utah in 2024, Vele appeared in 13 games with seven starts, recording 41 receptions for 475 yards with three TDs, tallying the most receiving yards, receptions and receiving touchdowns by a Broncos' seventh-round draft choice as a rookie. The Saints have utilized the San Diego native's 6-5, 210 frame in key spots. In 2025, he made 25 catches for 293 yards with two TDs. He had 19 grabs in the last four contests before suffering a shoulder injury.

JA'LYNN POLK

This second-year wideout was acquired by the Saints from New England at the start of the regular season, while rehabbing from a shoulder injury. Polk was a second round pick by the Patriots in 2024 out of Washington, following a college career at Texas Tech [2020] and Washington [2021-23], where he played in 41 games and had 143 receptions for 2,231 yards [15.6 avg.] with 18 touchdowns.

KEVIN AUSTIN JR.

A three-year letterman at Notre Dame, Kevin Austin Jr. played in 26 games with 13 starts and finished his college career with 54 receptions for 996 yards [18.4 avg.] with seven touchdowns. He enjoyed his most productive season as a senior in 2021, when he started all 13 games he played in and recorded 48 receptions for 888 yards [18.5 avg.] with seven touchdowns, earning first-team Phil Steele All-In-dependent honors.

Recording 11 receptions for 151 yards [13.7 avg.] in eight games in 2024, Austin stepped up late in the 2025 season with the season-ending injury to Vele, recording 13 grabs for 140 yards, with his first career touchdown.

TIGHT ENDS

JUWAN JOHNSON

The former Penn State and Oregon wideout joined the New Orleans Saints in 2020 following the NFL Draft and transitioned to tight end his second season in 2021. Overall, Johnson's 18 touchdown grabs since 2021 lead the team. In 2024, Johnson stepped up after missing most of training camp with a foot injury to play in all 17 games with five starts and make a career-high 50 receptions for a team-best/career-best 548 yards. With a career-high 77 receptions for a career-best 889 yards [11.5 avg.] with three touchdowns in 2025, Johnson joined Jimmy Graham as only the second Saints tight end with 75 grabs in a season.

FOSTER MOREAU

This veteran tight end and New Orleans native who was a standout at Jesuit High School and LSU signed with the Saints in the 2023 offseason after spending his first four campaigns with the Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders. In his career, Moreau has contributed both as a pass catcher and blocker, appearing in 104 regular season games with 70 starts and has recorded 151 receptions for 1,772 yards [11.7 avg.] with 18 touchdowns, also adding seven special teams tackles. Moreau returned to action in Week Five after suffering a significant knee injury in the 2024 season finale. He played in 11 games with nine starts, posting seven catches before suffering a season-ending ankle injury in Week 15.

DEFENSIVE LINE/EDGE

EDGE CAMERON JORDAN

New Orleans’ first choice in the 2011 NFL Draft [24th overall] out of the University of California, Jordan has played in 243 career regular season games with 242 starts, recording 857 tackles [529 solo], a franchise record 132 sacks for a loss of 870 yards, three interceptions, 69 pass breakups, 17 forced fumbles and 12 fumble recoveries. He has been selected to eight Pro Bowls, the most by a defensive Saint and three AP All-Pro teams.



SACK SURGE

Jordan’s leadership and experience has served as a crucial component in a season that has faced adversity. Embracing a new structure on defense, he opened every game from the edge position and finished with 47 tackles [28 solo], a club-best 10.5 sacks for a loss of 64.5 yards, tied for 13th in the NFL, two pass breakups, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. In his last eight contests, Jordan recorded eight sacks, fourth in the NFL over the period.

IRON MAN

Until missing the December 12, 2021 contest at the New York Jets on the Reserve/COVID-19 list, Jordan had enjoyed the longest active games played streak (172) among position players and the longest games started streak. Missing one contest in 2022 [eye], his first due to injury, Jordan has played in at least 16 contests in each of his 15 seasons. MOST SACKED

Jordan is now one of only 15 NFL players to have at least 15 sacks against two opponents, 17 against the Tampa Bay Buccaneers and 26 against the Atlanta Falcons (in 30 games), both NFC South divisional rivals. Jordan's 23 takedowns of former Atlanta quarterback Matt Ryan are the most sacks a player has had against an individual quarterback in NFL history.

Jordan has sacks against 29 different teams after dropping New York Jets signal-caller Brady Cook twice on Dec. 21. The Baltimore Ravens and Kansas City Chiefs are the only teams he doesn't have a sack against.

Jordan has sacked 52 different players in the regular season after dropping Titans signal-caller Cam Ward on December 28.



EDGE CHASE YOUNG

Originally selected by Washington with the second overall pick in the 2020 NFL Draft out of Ohio State, this talented edge rusher finished his sixth season and second in New Orleans. In six campaigns for Washington [2020-23], San Francisco [2023] and New Orleans [2024-], Young has appeared in 72 games with 44 starts and recorded 169 tackles [110 solo], 32 sacks, 39 stops for loss, 16 pass breakups, nine forced fumbles and six recoveries. The consensus NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year, Young recorded 7.5 sacks and made multiple splash plays with four forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries in his first season in 2020. In 2023, he played in seven games for Washington and nine for San Francisco following a midseason trade and tied his career-best with 7.5 takedowns in helping the 49ers advance to Super Bowl LVIII.

Young originally signed with New Orleans as unrestricted free agent in 2024, when he played in all 17 games and posted 31 tackles [21 solo], 5.5 sacks, three pass breakups and one forced fumble. In 2025 after missing the first five games with a calf injury, Young started the remaining 12 contests of the season, posting 38 tackles [22 solo], ten sacks to rank second on the team, ten stops for loss, four passes defensed, two forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries, tied for first in the NFL with teammate Pete Werner and two other players.

SPLASH PLAYER

Young was the only player in the NFL with double-digit sacks and three fumble recoveries, with only two players in the league had at least six takedowns and three fumble recoveries in 2025.

DT BRYAN BRESEE

The team’s first round selection in 2023 out of Clemson after being a three-time All-ACC selection, the Maryland native immediately found a role in New Orleans’ interior rotation and appeared in all 17 games, recording 24 tackles, 4.5 sacks and six pass breakups. His sack total was the highest by a Saints rookie defensive tackle since becoming an official statistic [1982] and his pass defense total was the most in club records for a rookie at the position since the statistic was first recorded [1980]. He was also tied for second in the league among defensive tackles.



Bresee enjoyed a breakout sophomore campaign, playing in all 17 games and tied for fourth in the NFL among defensive tackles with a career-high and team-leading 7.5 sacks. The 7.5 takedowns are the ninth-highest total in a single-season for a Saints defensive tackle and tied for fourth in the league at the position.

In the Oct. 5 win over the Giants, DB Jordan Howden picked up a fumble forced by Bresee and returned it 86 yards for a touchdown. In 2025, Bresee finished the season with 37 tackles [14 solo], 2.5 sacks, three passes defensed, one forced fumble and one blocked field goal, playing under a new defensive structure under coordinator Brandon Staley.

DT DAVON GODCHAUX

Davon Godchaux (pronounced duh-VAHN GOD-chaw) returned to his home state to play for New Orleans in his ninth NFL campaign after being acquired from New England. Originally a fifth round draft pick (178th overall) of the Miami Dolphins out of LSU in 2017, Godchaux has started 123-of-137 regular season games for the Dolphins (2017-20), Patriots (2021-24) and Saints (2025-), recording 474 tackles (221 solo), 5.5 sacks, 20 stops for loss, three pass breakups, three forced fumbles and one fumble recovery, as well as a solo stop in the 2021 Wild Card Playoff for New England.

In 2025, he played in all 17 contests with 16 starts and recorded 45 tackles (16 solo) and one forced fumble, plugging the middle for a run defense that improved from 30th in the NFL to sixth in opponent yards per rush.

DE CHRIS RUMPH II

Signed as a free agent in the offseason, Rumph is well-versed in defensive coordinator Brandon Staley’s system with the edge position. In his career, he’s played in 54 games and made 66 tackles (36 solo), five sacks, two passes defensed, one forced fumble, one fumble recovery and 22 special teams tackles, posting a career-best 14 coverage stops. Rumph finished ranked second on the team in 2025 in coverage stops to go with two takedowns and 35 tackles.

DT NATHAN SHEPHERD

Originally selected by the New York Jets in the third round of the 2018 NFL Draft out of Fort Hays State, this versatile defensive tackle finished his eighth NFL season, his third campaign with the Saints. The Ajax, Ontario, Canada native has appeared in 122 career games with 50 starts, totaling 245 tackles (125 solo) and 13.5 sacks for a loss of 114.5 yards. In 2025, he started in eight-of-16 appearances and had 47 stops (23 solo) with a career-high three sacks, his first career forced fumble and a blocked field goal.

LINEBACKERS

DEMARIO DAVIS

This dependable and sure-tackling defender joined the Saints in 2018 after spending his first six National Football League seasons with the New York Jets and Cleveland Browns. In his career, the Brandon, Miss. native has appeared in 227 regular season games with 213 starts for the Jets (2012-15, 2017), Browns (2016) and the Saints (2018-), recording 1,614 stops (992 solo), 45.0 sacks, four interceptions, 65 pass breakups, six forced fumbles and nine fumble recoveries.

THE CENTURION



Davis was the team leader with 143 tackles (79 solo), including six stops for loss, a split sack, three pass breakups, two forced fumbles to tie for the team lead and one fumble recovery. Davis finished the season tied for tenth in the National Football League in total tackles (press box statistics).

PETE WERNER

New Orleans selected this three-year starter from Ohio State in the second round of the 2021 NFL Draft. The Indianapolis native finished his college career playing in 47 career games with 35 starts, recording 185 tackles [111 solo], 16 stops for loss, four sacks, 11 pass breakups, four forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Werner helped power the Buckeyes to the College Football Playoff championship game as a senior in 2020, when he was voted by the Big Ten coaches as a first-team All-Conference selection and a Butkus Award semi-finalist, posting 54 tackles, 2.5 stops for loss, one sack and two forced fumbles.

NEW ORLEANS SAINTS SEASON IN REVIEW

In five seasons, Werner has played in 73 games with 63 starts and has recorded 402 tackles (253 solo), 2.5 sacks, one interception, ten pass breakups, two forced fumbles, five fumble recoveries and four special teams stops.

In 17 games with 15 starts in 2025, he ranked third on the team with 81 stops (50 solo), two sacks, a career-high five pass breakups and three fumble recoveries to tie for the National Football League lead with college and Saints teammate Chase Young and two other players..



SECONDARY

S JUSTIN REID

This versatile, hard-hitting, playmaking safety and South Louisiana native returned to his home state after signing with the Black and Gold during the 2025 offseason as an unrestricted free agent. Reid was originally selected by the Houston Texans in the third round (68th overall) in the 2018 NFL Draft out of Stanford. In seven NFL seasons, the former Dutchtown High School standout has played in 121 career regular season games with 117 starts for the Texans (2018-21), Kansas City Chiefs (2022-24) and Saints (2025-), recording 637 tackles (449 solo), 2 stops for a loss, 6.5 sacks, 11 interceptions, with two returned for touchdowns, 51 pass breakups, three forced fumbles, three fumble recoveries, 15 special teams stops and one blocked kick.

Reid started all 14 games he played in for his first season in New Orleans as a stabilizing force in the back end and finished with 72 tackles (37 solo), a split sack, a 49-yard interception return for a touchdown and five pass breakups.

CB ALONTAE TAYLOR

Selected by the Saints in the second round (49th overall) of the 2022 NFL Draft out of Tennessee, Taylor shook off early injuries to play in 13 games with nine starts and posted 45 tackles (38 solo) and a club-best 11 pass breakups, ranked fourth among NFL rookies.

Moving to the nickel position in 2023, possessing extensive experience on the inside and the outside, Taylor appeared in all 17 games with 13 starts and recorded 75 tackles, his first two career interceptions and a career-high 14 pass breakups, tied for second on the team and ninth in the NFL.

In 2024, Taylor played in all 17 games with 15 starts and ranked third on the team with a career-high 89 tackles (61 solo), was tied for fourth with four sacks and has added a club-best 16 passes defended and two forced fumbles to tie for the team best. His four sacks were tied for the most by a Saints cornerback with Alex Molden. His pass defense total was ranked fifth in the National Football League.

GET A HAND ON

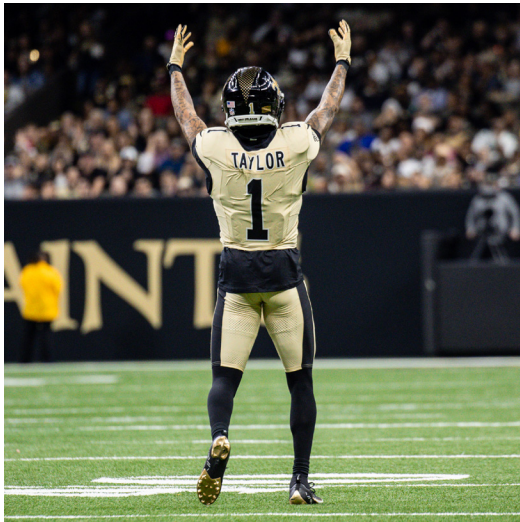
Taylor’s 16 pass breakups in 2024 were tied for third in the NFC and fifth in the NFL. His 52 since coming into the league in 2022 are ranked fourth in the league. DB DROP

In the Sept. 8, 2024 season-opening win over Carolina, Taylor became the first Saints defensive back to record three sacks in a contest since the statistic was officially recognized by the NFL in 1982. The only other defensive back to record three sacks on kickoff weekend is former Chargers S Rodney Harrison [vs. Buffalo, 9/6/98]. After splitting a sack on October 27 at the Los Angeles Chargers, Taylor’s four sacks are tied for the highest total by a cornerback in Saints record books with Alex Molden’s four in 1997, while the total ranked third among defensive backs and led all cornerbacks. Taylor’s seven career takedowns are the most by a Saints cornerback all-time.

No Saints QB has ever recorded 282+ passing yards, 2+ passing TDs and 0 INTs on the road in one of their first two starts. He and Head Coach Kellen Moore became the first rookie quarterback and first-year coach duo to win a game in franchise history. **vs. Atlanta (11/23):** Started. Finished 30-for-43 (69.8 pct.) for 243 yards, an interception and a 74.1 passer rating. Carried seven times for 22 yards. **at Miami (11/30):** Started. Finished 26-for-38 (65.8 pct.) for 239 yards, two touchdowns, one interception and a 91.9 passer rating. Rushed six times for 18 yards. Also rushed for a successful two-point conversion attempt and intercepted on a two-point conversion attempt. **at Tampa Bay (12/7):** Started and finished 13-of-20 (65.0 pct.) for 144 yards.
