THE MATCHUP

The New Orleans Saints will begin the 2024 preseason this week when they play at the Arizona Cardinals at State Farm Stadium in Glendale, Az. The Saints and Cardinals will meet for the seventh time in the preseason, with New Orleans leading the series 5-1.

With over two weeks of training camp in the books, both teams enter 2024 with optimism. New Orleans finished 9-8 and second in the NFC South last season, after winning four of the last five contests in 2023. The Saints proved to be a balanced team finishing in the top ten in both points per game [23.6-ninth] and scoring defense [19.2-eighth].

In 2023, QB **Derek Carr** completed 375-of-548 [68.4 pct.] passes for 3,878 yards with 25 touchdowns and a 97.7 passer rating. He will lead a potent offensive attack that features explosive players in **Alvin Kamara**, **Chris Olave**, **Rashid Shaheed** and **Taysom Hill**. C **Erik McCoy**, who participated in his first Pro Bowl last season, will lead a reconfigured offensive line that will feature three new starters.

On defense, the club's front line increased its depth, including a trio of standouts at end in Carl Granderson, Cameron Jordan and Chase Young. Demario Davis leads the linebacker corps after leading the team in tackles for the sixth consecutive season in 2023 with 121 stops. Willie Gay Jr. and Pete Werner will compete at outside linebacker alongside Davis. The Black and Gold secondary is led by FS Tyrann Mathieu, who tied for the team lead with CB Paulson Adebo with four interceptions in 2023. Adebo led the team with six overall takeaways and ranked third in the NFL with 18 passes defensed.

One of the NFL's top-ranked special teams units returns its core group at the major specialist positions and is led by an All-Pro returner in Shaheed and captain **J.T. Gray**, whose 65 coverage stops since 2019 rank second in the NFL.

Following Saturday's tilt in Glendale, the Saints will return to UC-Irvine for one more week of training camp out west. From August 15-16, the Saints and San Francisco 49ers will participate in joint practices. The Black and Gold will then travel to Northern California to play the 49ers in a nationally televised contest on Sunday, Aug. 18. The team then returns for their final week of training camp in New Orleans, including workouts open to the public at Tulane University on Tuesday, Aug. 20 and then at a transformed Caesars Superdome on Friday, Aug. 23, closing out the preseson by hosting the Tennessee Titans on Sunday, Aug. 25.

THE HEAD COACHES



Dennis Allen was hired as the 17th head coach in New Orleans Saints history on February 8, 2022. Now in his 29th year coaching and 23rd in the NFL, Allen has spent 14 seasons

in New Orleans in two separate stints, including six-and-a-half campaigns (2015-21) as the team's defensive coordinator prior to being promoted to head coach.

During his 23 years of coaching in the NFL, Allen has worked with 13 players who have combined for 26 Pro Bowl selections and he has also coached two Associated Press NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year winners and three members of the Pro Football Hall of Fame.

Allen's defenses have consistently been among the most productive in the NFL in a number of categories, including scoring defense, total yards allowed and sacks. The team's defensive play-caller since the middle of the 2015 season, the Saints are the only team in the National Football League to rank in the top ten in opponent points per game each of the past four seasons.

In 2023, Allen guided the Saints to win four of their last five games as the team turned in a 9-8 performance, narrowly missing a playoff berth. New Orleans finished 5-3 at home, winning their last three at the Caesars Superdome and captured their last three divisonal contests, including convincing victories over the Tampa Bay Buccaneers and Atlanta Falcons to close the season.

Prior to rejoining the Saints in 2015, Allen served as head coach of the Oakland Raiders from 2012-14 and as defensive coordinator of the Denver Broncos in 2011.

Allen played safety at Texas A&M from 1992-95, where he started the final 21 games of his career before being signed as an undrafted free agent by the Buffalo Bills in 1996. Prior to entering the National Football League coaching ranks in 2002, Allen served as a graduate assistant at his alma mater from 1996-99 and as a secondary coach at the University of Tulsa from 2000-01. He earned a bachelor of business administration degree and a master's in kinesiology from Texas A&M.

Raised in Hurst, Texas, Allen and his wife Alisson have a daughter, Layla and a son, Garrison.



Jonathan Gannon became an NFL head coach for the first time when hired by Arizona on February 14, 2023. Gannon joined Arizona following two seasons [2021-22] as the de-

fensive coordinator with the Philadelphia Eagles. He has 16 years of experience in the NFL with the Cardinals (2023), Eagles (2021-22), Colts (2018-20), Vikings (2014-17), Titans (2012-13), Rams (2009-11) and Falcons (2007).

In his first season with Arizona in 2023, Gannon led the NFL's third-youngest team that relied heavily on rookies but was also highly competitive. Despite playing the league's second-toughest schedule with eight games against playoff teams, the Cardinals held a lead in 14-of-17 games played. Gannon led the Cardinals to three wins vs. teams that made the postseason, including two on the East Coast in the month of December (Pittsburgh and Philadelphia). Five teams that qualified for the '23 postseason (Texans, Buccaneers, Rams, Chiefs and Dolphins) did not have as many wins vs. playoff teams during the regular season. His debut season in Arizona saw him help to develop the team's rookie class, which led the NFL in combined starts [64] and combined snaps on offense and defense [4,654] in 2023.

The Eagles qualified for the postseason and boasted a top-10 defense in each of their two seasons [2021-22] under Gannon, ranking second in total defense in 2022 [301.5 ypg.] and tenth in the NFL in 2021 [328.8 ypg.]. From 2021-22, the Eagles defense led the NFL with 99 sacks, ranked third in total defense [315.1 ypg.], third in pass defense [200.4 ypg.], tied for fourth in total return TDs [7] and interception-return TDs [7] and interception-return TDs [4] and tied for tenth in interceptions [29]. In 2022, the Eagles featured the NFL's top-ranked pass defense [179.8 ypg.] and the league's eighthranked scoring defense [20.2 ppg.].

Gannon played collegiately as a safety at Louisville and appeared in nine games as a redshirt freshman in 2002 before suffering a career-ending hip injury in his first career start at Cincinnati. Following the injury, he worked as a student assistant at Louisville for three seasons (2003-05) and one season as a graduate assistant (2006).

Raised in Cleveland, Ohio, Gannon and his wife, Gina, have three children - Rocco, Lola and Angelo.

SERIES HISTORY

The Saints and Cardinals will meet for the seventh time in the preseason and for the first time since 2018 (a scheduled 2021 meeting at the Caesars Superdome was cancelled due to Hurricane Ida).

New Orleans played the Cardinals (then based in St. Louis) for the franchise's first game played in Louisiana and first win, a 23-14 preseason victory on Aug. 12, 1967 at Shreveport's Independence Bowl. In another neutral site contest, the Saints beat the Cardinals, 17-10 on Aug. 5, 2012 in the Hall of Fame Game in Canton, Ohio, the day after T William Roaf was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame.

The Saints and Cardinals have played 31 times in the regular season with the Cardinals leading the series 16-15. The Cardinals won the first three games, including both played in 1968, when they were in the NFL Century divison. The Saints won their first game against the Cardinals on Nov. 2, 1969, 51-42 at Busch Stadium. In another memorable contest, the Saints beat the Cardinals 14-0 on Dec. 8, 1974 in the team's final contest at Tulane Stadium.

In their only postseason meeting, the Saints defeated the Cardinals, 45-14, in the NFC Divisional Playoff at the Superdome on Jan. 16, 2010, en route to the Super Bowl XLIV Championship.


EVANS SELECTED TO SAINTS RING OF HONOR

Former Saints G Jahri Evans will be inducted into the club's Ring of Honor during a halftime ceremony of the team's contest against the Cleveland Browns on November 17.

Evans, 6-4, 318, was originally a fourth round draft pick (108th overall) of the Saints in 2006 out of Bloomsburg and developed into an anchor for one of the most dominant offenses in NFL history during his tenure with the Saints. The Philadelphia, Pa. native started all 169 regular season games he played in at right guard and all of the team's ten postseason contests during that period, including all three during the 2009 campaign when the Saints captured Super Bowl XLIV.

A five-time Associated Press All-Pro (2009-13), Evans was selected first-team four times, twice as much as any other Saint. Evans was selected to six straight Pro Bowls (2009-14) and was named to the Pro Football Hall of Fame's 2010's All-Decade Team. During his 11-year tenure, the Saints were ranked first in the NFL in total offense (net yards per game) six times (2006, 2008-09, 2011, 2014 and 2016) and in scoring (points per game) twice (2008-09). The 274 sacks surrendered by the Saints offensive ine from 2006-16 were the lowest total in the NFL over the period and the unit was recognized twice [2009 and 2011] as the winner of the Madden Protector Offensive Line Award.

Evans closed out his playing career starting 14 games at right guard for the Green Bay Packers in 2017, finishing with 183 total games played/started. A Pro Football Hall of Fame semifinalist in 2023 and finalist in 2024, Evans began his coaching career as an offensive assistant for the Saints in 2023.

FAMILY TIES

Numerous Saints players, coaches and administrators are not the only members of their families to make a name for themselves in pro football. 18 Saints roster players, coaches or front office staff have relatives who have played, coached or served in the front office in the NFL.

Head Coach Dennis Allen - Late father, Grady Allen, played linebacker for the Atlanta Falcons from 1968-72.

Offensive Coordinator Klint Kubiak - Father, Gary, played quarterback for the Denver Broncos from 1983-91 and served as an assistant for 15 years for Denver, San Francisco and Minnesota. Gary Kubiak was head coach of the Houston Texans from 2006-13 and the Denver Broncos from 2015-16, including the Super Bowl 50 champions.

Vice President/Asst. General Manager-College Personnel Jeff Ireland - Stepson of Chiefs Hall of Fame linebacker/center E.J. Holub. Grandson of Philadelphia Eagles running back and Chicago Bears personnel exec. Jim Parmer.

National Scout Terry Wooden - Brother, JoJo is Senior Director of Player Personnel for the Las Vegas Raiders.

QB Derek Carr - Older brother, David was the No. 1 overall pick in the 2002 NFL Draft by the Houston Texans and played quarterback in the league for 11 seasons with Houston, Carolina, the New York Giants and San Francisco. Uncle, Lon Boyett, played tight end for Tampa Bay, the Raiders and San Francisco.

LB Demario Davis - Cousin of the late Steve McNair, the standout quarterback for the Tennessee Titans [1995-2005] and Baltimore Ravens [2006-07].

TE Taysom Hill - Brother-in-law, David Nixon, played linebacker and on special teams for the Oakland Raiders (2009), Houston Texans (2010) and St. Louis Rams (2010-11).

DB Jordan Howden - Cousin, Saladin Martin, played cornerback with the New York Jets (1980) and San Francisco 49ers (1981).

TE Juwan Johnson - Brother, George, played defensive end for eight years in the NFL with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, Minnesota Vikings, Detroit Lions and Saints.

DE Cameron Jordan - Father, Steve, had a prolific 13year career at tight end for the Minnesota Vikings, with six Pro Bowl selections, being inducted into their Ring of Honor.

C/G Erik McCoy - Cousin of former Dolphins and Buccaneers running back Jorvorski Lane.

WR Samson Nacua - Brother of Los Angeles Rams wide receiver Puka Nacua.

LB Nephi Sewell - One brother Penei, is a member of the Detroit Lions after getting selected seventh overall in the 2021 NFL Draft. Another brother, Noah, was selected by the Chicago Bears in the fifth round of the 2023 NFL Draft.

WR Equanimeous St. Brown - Younger brother, Amon-Ra St. Brown plays wide receiver for the Lions.

LB Pete Werner - Father, Greg, played nine games at right end and on special teams for the New York Jets in 1989 and went to training camp with the Philadelphia Eagles in 1990.

WR Cedrick Wilson Jr. - Father, Cedrick Sr., is a former NFL wideout, who played for seven years in the league, including a Super Bowl championship with the Pittsburgh Steelers.

Area Scout Joey Vitt - Father, Joe Vitt, is a longtime NFL assistant coach, who served as assistant head coach/linebackers of the Saints from 2006-16 and also had coaching stints with the Seattle Seahawks, Colts, Los Angeles/St. Louis Rams, Kansas City Chiefs and Jets.

Area Scout Matt Phillips - Father, Ted, worked in the Chicago Bears front office from 1983-2022, including serving his last 24 years as team president.

ROSTER ROLL CALL

On the Saints roster as of August 5, 47 were on the active roster, a reserve list of the practice squad at the end of the 2023 season. Among newcomers, the roster includes three unrestricted free agents, four veteran free agents, two draft picks and one rookie free agent.

Of the players, 19 have less than four years of previous NFL experience, including four players who were in their first training camp of preseason. The following is a breakdown of New Orleans' roster by years of experience (year entering): 14 years - 1, 13 years - 1, 12 years - 1, 11 years - 1, 8 years-7, 7 years - 4, 6 years - 9, 5 years - 9, 4 years - 10, 3 years - 7, 2 years - 14, 1 year - 7, rookies - 20.

HIGHER EDUCATION

61 colleges and universities are represented on the Saints' roster. Of that total, 18 are represented by multiple Saints, four from Ohio State, Notre Dame and Tennessee, three from BYU, Fresno State, Mississippi State and Oregon and two from Appalachian State, Clemson, LSU, Michigan, Northern Iowa, Minnesota, Oregon State, South Carolina, TCU, Tulane and Vanderbilt.

TURNOVER RATIO LEADER


After finishing 31st in the NFL at -11 in 2022, New Orleans finished the 2023 season tied for third in turnover ratio at +11 and ranked second in the NFC. The Saints won the turnover ratio battle in eight games in 2023 and posted a 6-2 record in those contests.

BUCKING THE ODDS

The Saints have a long tradition of finding players as free agents signed after the draft that make an impact immediately or after developing their careers initially on the practice squad. Several undrafted Saints on the roster play key roles on offense, defense and special teams.

Over the past 21 years, the Saints (2018-22: DB J.T. Gray, WR/RS Deonte Harty and WR/RS Rashid Shaheed) and San Diego/Los Angeles Chargers (2003: G Kris Dielman, TE Antonio Gates and WR Kasim Osgood) are the only two teams to have three players signed as undrafted free agents be selected to a Pro Bowl for the team that originally signed them.

In 2023, Shaheed was no longer a secret around the National Football League, as he caught 46 passes for 719 yards (club-best 15.6 avg.) with five touchdown grabs to tie for the team lead, including seven receptions of 40-or-more yards, while also carrying seven times for 37 yards and ranking second in the NFC and third in the NFL in punt return average (13.6) and tenth in the league in all-purpose yards (1,479), despite missing two contests with a quad injury. Tying for the team lead with six total touchdowns including a punt return touchdown, Shaheed was selected as both Pro Bowl starter as a return specialist and as a first-team Associated Press All-Pro as a punt returner.

Originally signed as an undrafted free agent in 2018, spending part of his rookie season on the practice squad, Gray's 65 special teams tackles since 2019 rank second in the National Football League, as he has been selected as both an Associated Press first-team All-Pro and Pro Bowler. In 2023, he finished with 11 coverage stops to lead the team and tie for 12th in the NFL, despite missing three contests with injuries.

WR Marquez Callaway led the team in 2021 in two of four major receiving categories with a club-best 46 receptions for a team-high 698 yards [15.2 avg., ranked tenth in the NFL] and a club-best six TD grabs as the team's only offensive skill player to play in all 17 games. Overall, in 45 games with 17 starts, he has 83 receptions for 1,069 yards with seven touchdowns.

TE Juwan Johnson first led his position group with four touchdown receptions in 2021, converting to the position that offseason after playing wideout in college and as a rookie in 2020, signed as an undrafted free agent from Oregon. In 2022, he led the Black and Gold tight ends in receiving with 42 grabs for 508 yards with a club-best and career-high seven touchdowns, tied for third at the position in the NFL. Johnson led the team's tight ends with 37 grabs for 368 yards with four touchdown grabs in 2023. Johnson has led the Saints with 11 receiving touchdowns over the past two seasons, tied for fourth over that period among league tight ends.

DE Carl Granderson joined the club in 2019 as an undrafted free agent out of Wyoming and has appeared in 71 regular season games with 24 starts, posting 179 tackles (103 solo), 23 sacks for a loss of 151.5 yards, two passes defensed, three forced fumbles and two recoveries. In 2023, Granderson earned the starting right end position and posted a career-high 78 tackles (44 solo), led the team with a career-best 8.5 sacks for a loss of 55 yards, defensed one pass and forced a fumble and recovered one. Granderson's 78 stops ranked fifth in the National Football League among defensive linemen and were the most by a Saints lineman since 2004.

After originally signed as an undrafted free agent out of Utah in 2022, LB **Nephi Sewell** has become a valued member of the special teams units in his first two seasons, while also providing depth on defense. In his first full season in 2023 on the active roster, Sewell totaled five stops and one forced fumble on special teams and ten defensive tackles.

In 2023, the Saints featured a pair of rookies at kicker and punter that made solid contributions to a highly-ranked special teams unit.

K Blake Grupe was signed by New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Notre Dame, where he played his graduate campaign in 2022, after handling kicking duties at Arkansas State from 2017-21. In 17 games, Grupe made 30 of 37 field goal attempts and all 40 PAT attempts to lead the team with 130 points, with 76 touchbacks on kickoffs, ranked third in the NFL. Grupe's field goal and points totals led NFL rookies in 2023, setting the team record for field goals.

P **Lou Hedley** was signed as an undrafted free agent in 2023 out of the University of Miami, where the played from 2019-22. As a rookie in 2023, the Australian punted 75 times for 3,224 yards with a 43.0 gross punting average, a 39.7 net and 31 inside the 20-yard line, the second-highest total in team history since the statistic was first recorded in 1976 and tied for fifth in the NFL.

OUARTERBACKS

DEREK CARR



On March 6, 2023, the Saints agreed to terms with Derek Carr on a four-year contract to solidify the quarterback position. He spent the first nine seasons of his NFL career with the Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders. Originally selected in the second round [36th overall] of the 2014 NFL Draft by the Raiders out of Fresno State, the Bakersfield, Calif. native has started all 159 career regular season games he has played in, the most starts at the position over that time, completing 3,576-of-5,506 passes [64.0 pct.] for 39,100 yards with 242 touchdown passes, 107 interceptions and a 92.3 passer rating, while adding 885 rushing yards and six touchdowns.

Since entering the league in 2014, Carr ranks first in the NFL in completions, third in passing yardage and sixth in passing touchdowns. He became the third quarterback in NFL history to pass for 3,000-plus yards in each of his first ten seasons, joining Pro Football Hall of Fame signal-caller Peyton Manning and Russell Wilson. He is just the fourth player in NFL history to reach 35,000 passing yards in his first nine seasons and has completed 306 passes of 25+ yards since he entered the league in 2014, tied for third-most in the NFL over that span.

Carr started all 17 games in 2023 and completed 375-of-548 passes [68.4 pct.] for 3,878 yards with 25 touchdowns, eight interceptions and a 97.7 passer rating. He finished his first season in Black and Gold ranked second in the NFL in fourth quarter passer rating [106.9], sixth in completion percentage, seventh in completions and tenth in TD passes and passer rating.

Carr finished out the 2023 season strong in the final six games (Dec. 3-Jan. 7), providing optimism for a carryover into the 2024 campaign. In the six-contest stretch, he completed 131-of-176 passes (league best 74.4 pct.) for 1,343 yards, with an NFL-best 15 touchdowns, only three interceptions and an NFL-best 117.2 passer rating.

TAYSOM HILL

Hill has brought unheralded versatility to the Saints offense and special teams. A participant on special teams since midseason in 2017, as well as a signal-caller and as a runner and receiver, Hill has played in 97 regular season games with 41 starts at several positions. He has carried 398 times for 2,159 yards, the most by a Saint not to play running back, with 27 touchdowns, tied for seventh in club records. In the passing game, he caught 76 passes for 756 yards with 11 touchdowns, completed 191-of-298 passes [64.1 pct.] for 2,348 yards with 11 touchdowns, returned 19 kickoffs for 447 yards, made 15 special teams tackles and blocked one punt.

In 2023, Hill ranked second on the team in rushing with 81 carries for 401 yards [5.0 avg.] with four touchdowns, caught a career-high 33 passes for 291 yards with two touchdowns, completed six-of-11 passes for 83 yards with one touchdown and a 109.3 passer rating, returned a kickoff 18 yards

RENAISSANGE MAN

Hill turned in an all-around standout performance in the Nov. 5, 2023 win over the Chicago Bears, where he led the team in rushing, carrying 11 times for 52 yards [4.7 avg.], completed a three-yard touchdown pass to tight end Juwan Johnson and caught four passes for 13 yards with one touchdown.

A talented runner and receiver, who was selected by the Saints in the third round of the 2017 NFL Draft out of the University of Tennessee, Kamara enjoyed an outstanding rookie campaign. He ranked first on the club and sixth in the NFL in yards from scrimmage (1,554), second on the team in rushing and receiving, carrying 120 times for 728 yards (6.1 avg) with eight TDs and a two-point conversion, catching 81 passes for 826 yards (10.2 avg) with five TDs and a kickoff return for a TD. Kamara set a club rookie record with 14 total scores, tied for second in the NFL and finished first in the league in yards per carry.

Kamara was the first Saints offensive rookie selected to the Pro Bowl since Rueben Mayes [1986], as an Associated Press second team All-Pro [flex], the club's first rookie All-Pro since 1993. He was also named The Sporting News NFL Rookie of the Year and AP NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year.

• In 13 games in 2023, Kamara led New Orleans in rushing with 180 carries for 694 yards and a club-best five touchdowns. Kamara also ranked second among National Football League running backs in receiving with 75 receptions for 466 yards with one touchdown for a club-best 1,160 total yards from scrimmage and six total touchdowns.

In 101 career regular season games with 70 starts, Kamara has carried 1,315 times for 5,829 yards [4.5 avg.] with 54 touchdowns and has caught 505 passes for 4,219 yards with 23 touchdowns. JAMAAL WILLIAMS

This seven-year NFL veteran was signed by the New Orleans Saints as an unrestricted free agent in the 2023 offseason. In seven NFL seasons with Green Bay (2017-20), Detroit (2021-22) and New Orleans (2023-), Williams has played in 103 games with 44 starts, carrying 1,021 times for 3,958 yards with 31 touchdowns, also catching 178 passes for 1,253 yards with eight touchdowns for 5,211 total yards from scrimmage. Providing a short yardage threat for the Black and Gold in 2023, Williams rushed for 306 yards with one TD, forming a rushing trio with Kamara and his former college teammate, Hill.

KENDRE MILLER

Miller was selected by New Orleans in the third round of the 2023 NFL Draft out of TCU, after serving as one of the offensive centerpieces for the College Football Playoff finalists, Miller was a consensus All-Big 12 selection in 2022, after starting all 14 games he played in and carrying 242 times for 1,399 yards [6.2 avg.] and 17 touchdowns. He was limited to eight games in 2023, where he carried 41 times for 156 yards and one TD and ten receptions for 117 yards. Olave became the third Saints rookie to reach 1,000 receiving yards and the first Saints rookie since WR Danny Abramowicz (1967) to lead the team in receiving, receiving yardage and yards per catch in his first campaign.

In 2023, Olave took the next step in his career, leading the team in receiving and receiving yardage for the second consecutive season with 87 receptions for 1,123 yards and five touchdowns, tying for the team lead. The Southern California native became the seventh Saint with 85 receptions in a season and the sixth Saints with 1,100 receiving yards in a single season. His 87 grabs are the 11th highest single-season total in franchise history and the yardage total ranks 16th. He reached the 100-yard receiving mark in five contests.

RASHID SHAHEED

This third-year wideout has made his mark for New Orleans in both the passing game and the return game, where he was selected to the Pro Bowl and voted as an AP All-Pro in 2023. In addition to the return duties in 2023, Shaheed enjoyed a breakout season on offense, when he recorded 46 receptions for 719 yards [15.6 avg.] with five touchdowns grabs, finishing 12th in the NFL in yards per catch.

A.T. PERRY

New Orleans selected this big-bodied, sure-handed target in the sixth round of the 2023 NFL Draft out of Wake Forest. At 6-5, 205, the South Florida native possesses the ability to make the tough catch in traffice. During his college career, Perry set numerous Wake Forest receiving records, including a program-best 28 touchdowns. In his last two seasons, he became the first player in Demon Deacons history to have multiple 1,000-yard receiving seasons and shattered the single-season touchdown grab mark with 15 in 2021.

Perry moved into the wide receiver rotation at midseason and in the last eight contests of the 2023 season, recorded 12 grabs for 246 yards (20.5 avg.) with four touchdowns. New Orleans will look forward to utilizing this tall target more extensively in 2024.

CEDRICK WILSON JR.

This seventh-year wideout was signed by New Orleans to a two-year contract at the start of free agency to compete for snaps on offense and to provide veteran leadership to the wideout room. In 68 regular seson games, he has recorded 101 receptions for 1,269 yards with 11 touchdowns. In 2023, the Memphis native posted 22 catches for 296 yards with three touchdowns, adding three grabs for 37 yards in the postseason.

TIGHT ENDS

JUWAN JOHNSON

The former Penn State and Oregon wideout joined the Saints in 2020 following the NFL Draft and transitioned to tight end his second season. In 2022, the New Jersey native had a breakout campaign as he appeared in 16 games with 12 starts and finished with 42 receptions for 508 yards and a teambest seven touchdown grabs. Johnson was tied for third among National Football League tight ends in receiving touchdowns. Overall, Johnson's 15 touchdown grabs since 2021 lead the team.

In 13 games with 11 starts in 2023, Johnson finished with 37 receptions for 368 yards and four touchdowns to lead the position group in all major receiving categories. In his final four contests, three of which were Saints victories, Johnson had 17 grabs for 206 yards and three touchdowns.

BIG TARGET

FOSTER MOREAU

This veteran tight end and New Orleans native finished his fifth NFL season and first with the Black and Gold after spending his first four campaigns with the Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders. In his career, Moreau has appeared in 76 regular season games with 44 starts and has recorded 112 reception s for 1,300 yards [11.6 avg.] with 13 TDs, also adding seven special teams tackles.

Moreau got on the scoreboard for the first time as a Saint on Oct. 8, 2023, at New England with a fourth quarter six-yard grab. He appeared in 15 games with ten starts and provided both a pass-catching and blocking presence with 21 grabs for 193 yards to rank second among Saints tight ends.

OFFENSIVE LINE

ERIK McCOY

New Orleans traded up in the second round of the 2019 NFL Draft to select this standout from Texas A&M, who was a three-year starter, anchoring the middle of the Aggies line. In 2019, the East Texas native was the first Saint in franchise history to start at center in Week One, opening all 16 contests. McCoy has opened all 74 contests he has appeared in at center and signed a five-year contract extension with the team in 2022. Selected as a team captain for the first time in 2023, McCoy was the only Saints offensive lineman to open all 17 games and was named to his first Pro Bowl. The Saints will lean heavily on McCoy's leadership in 2024 as the offensive line will open the season with three new starters.

CESAR RUIZ

The hard-working, talented and intelligent lineman is a perfect fit for New Orleans' culture. Ruiz was selected with the 24th overall pick in the 2020 NFL Draft out of Michigan. The three-year letterman played in 36 games in college, starting his last 31, including the final 26 at center. As a rookie, Ruiz settled in at right guard in the last 15 games with nine starts, as well as both postseason contests. When McCoy suffered a lower leg injury in the first quarter of the 2021 season-opening win over Green Bay, Ruiz transitioned over to center, where the Saints did not give up a sack in his four starts and was the only lineman in 2021 to start every game. In 2023, he rebounded from a lis franc injury in 2022 to open 16 contests at right quard.

CAMERON JORDAN

New Orleans' first choice in the 2011 NFL Draft [24th overall] out of the University of California, Jordan has played in 209 career regular season games with 208 starts, recording 776 tackles [479 solo], a franchise record 117.5 sacks for a loss of 779.5 yards, two interceptions, 63 passes defensed, 15 forced fumbles and 11 fumble recoveries. In 2023, despite a lingering ankle injury, Jordan started every contest and recorded 43 tackles [20 solo], two sacks, three passes defensed and one fumble recovery.

The following week at Philadelphia, Jan. 1, 2023, Jordan also started his 200th career game, joining Drew Brees as only the second player to open 200 contests in franchise history. BRYAN BRESEE

The team's first round selection in the 2023 NFL Draft out of Clemson after being a three-time All-ACC selection, the Maryland native played in 26 games with 21 starts for the Tigers, producing 54 tackles (35 solo), 15 stops for loss, nine sacks, a forced fumble, an interception and five passes defensed. Despite injuries and personal tragedy in 2022, Bresee fought through to manage 16 stops, 5.5 tackles for loss, 3.5 sacks and two passes defensed, earning second-team All-Conference.

Bresee immediately found a role in New Orleans' interior rotation and appeared in all 17 games, recording 24 tackles, 4.5 sacks and six passes defensed. His takedown total was the highest by a Saints rookie defensive tackle since becoming an official statistic in 1982 and his pass defense total was the most in club records for a rookie at the position since the statistic was officially recorded in 1980, Bresee also tied for second in the league among defensive tackles in 2023.

CARL GRANDERSON

Signed by New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Wyoming in 2019, Granderson posted 17.5 sacks in college and possesses the prototypical frame for an NFL pass rusher. Granderson has become a sigificant cog in the team's defensive line rotation with 179 tackles, 23 sacks, two passes defensed, three forced fumbles and two recoveries.

Earning the starting right defensive end position in 2023, Granderson posted a career-high 78 tackles [44 solo], led the team with a career-best 8.5 sacks for a 55-yard loss, one pass defense, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery. On Sept. 23, 2023, the franchise recognized Granderson's work ethic and commitment to both stopping the run and rushing the passer by agreeing to a four-vear contract extension.

PAYTON TURNER

With the 28th overall pick in the 2021 NFL Draft out of Houston, the Saints added to the defensive line with this gifted pass rusher. In 15 career games, Turner has recorded 29 tackles, three sacks, one fumble recovery and one blocked field goal. In 2023, the Texan suffered a toe injury in the season-opening win over Tennessee that would sideline him for 15 contests. However, Turner returned for the season finale vs. Atlanta and recorded the first fumble recovery of his career, showing his promise both with his pass rush and playmaking abilities. Turner is part of a group of talented defensive linemen competing for snaps in the preseason.

CHASE YOUNG

Originally selected by Washington with the second overall pick in the 2020 NFL Draft out of Ohio State, this talented edge rusher is entering his fifth season in the NFL and first with New Orleans. In four campaigns for Washington (2020-23) and San Francisco (2023), Young appeared in 43 regular season games with 32 starts and recorded 100 tackles (67 solo), 16.5 sacks, 20 stops for loss, nine passes defensed, six forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries. The consensus NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year, Young recorded 44 tackles, 7.5 sacks, ten stops for loss and made multiple splash plays with four forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries in 2020. Young played in only 12 games from 2021-22 after suffering a knee injury midway through his second campaign. In 2023, he played in seven games for Washington and nine for San Francisco following a midseason trade and tied his career-best with 7.5 takedowns in helping the 49ers advance to Super Bowl LVIII. Young has fit in with the New Orleans defensive line and his addition will be a boost to the front.

NATHAN SHEPHERD

Originally selected by the New York Jets in the third round of the 2018 NFL Draft out of Fort Hays State, this versatile defensive tackle enters his seventh NFL season, his second campaign with the Saints. The Ajax, Ontario, Canada native has appeared in 90 career games with 29 starts, totaling 161 tackles [86 solo] and nine sacks for a loss of 75 yards. In 2023, this valued free agent acquisition started all 17 games for New Orleans in the middle, posting career-highs in tackles [50], solo stops [26] and sacks [three].

KHALEN SAUNDERS

Originally selected by the Kansas City Chiefs in the third round of the 2019 NFL Draft out of Western Illinois, Saunders enters his sixth NFL season and second with New Orleans. Signed as an unrestricted free agent in the 2023 offseason, Saunders combined with two other newcomers in Shepherd and Bresee to form a new interior front, recording career-highs in tackles (57) and solo stops (24). In 55 career regular season games with 22 starts, Saunders has recorded 138 tackles (64 solo), 4.5 sacks, three passes defensed and four stops for loss.

LINEBACKERS



DEMARIO DAVIS

This dependable and sure-tackling defender joined the New Orleans Saints in 2018 after spending his first six NFL seasons with the New York Jets and Cleveland Browns. In his career, the Brandon, Miss. native has appeared in 194 regular season games with 180 starts for the Jets (2012-15, 2017), Browns (2016) and the Saints (2018-), recording 1,335 stops (860 solo), 42.5 sacks, three interceptions, 55 passes defensed, four forced fumbles, eight fumble recoveries and 24 special teams tackles.

In 2023, Davis started every contest and again led the Black and Gold in tackles with 121 stops [74 solo], ranked second with 6.5 sacks and added one forced fumble, one fumble recovery and four passes defensed. He joined LB Joe Federspiel as only the second Saint to have 100 stops in six straight seasons, having done so in his last seven campaigns and his tenth season overall of his 12-year National Football League career

PETE WERNER



New Orleans selected this three-year starter from Ohio State in the second round of the 2021 NFL Draft. The Indianapolis native finished his college career playing in 47 career games with 35 starts, recording 185 tackles (111 solo), 16 stops for loss, four sacks, 11 passes defensed, four forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Werner helped power the Buckeyes to the College Football Playoff championship game as a senior in 2020, when he was voted by the Big Ten coaches as a first-team All-Conference selection and a Butkus Award semifinalist, posting 54 tackles, 2.5 stops for loss, one sack and two forced fumbles.

In three seasons, Werner has played in 43 games with 35 starts and has recorded 231 tackles [151 solo], a split sack, one interception, four passes defensed, two forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and three special teams stops.

Werner finished the season ranked second on the team with 93 stops, a split sack, one interception, one pass defense and two fumble recoveries, tied for the team lead.

A contributor on defense for the back-to-back Super Bowl Champion Kansas City Chiefs, this sideline to sideline linebacker joined the Saints at the start of the 2024 free agency period. In Kansas City, Gay played in 57 regular season games with 47 starts, posting 231 tackles [148 solo], five sacks, four interceptions, including one returned for a touchdown, 19 passes defensed, two forced fumbles, four fumble recoveries and two special teams stops. In nine postseason games played/starts, Gay has accumulated 29 stops, a split sack and three passes defensed.

In his final season in Kansas City, Gay played in 16 regular season games with 15 starts for the Chiefs and finished with 58 tackles (44 solo), one sack, one interception, four passes defensed, one forced fumble and a career-high three fumble recoveries. In three postseason starts en route to the Super Bowl Championship, Gay collected nine more stops and one pass defense.

KHALEKE HUDSON

Originally selected by the Washington Commanders in the third round of the 2020 NFL Draft out of Michigan, Hudson enters his fifth NFL season and his first with New Orleans. In four campaigns in the nation's capital, Hudson appeared in 58 regular season contests with 12 starts and recorded 90 tackles (51 solo), seven stops for loss, one sack, two passes defensed and 18 special teams stops. The Saints will look to utilize Hudson's speed for contributions both on defense and the team's coverage units in 2024.

SECONDARY

S TYRANN MATHIEU

This versatile, hard-hitting, playmaking safety and New Orleans native enters his third season with his hometown team, signing after the 2022 NFL Draft. Mathieu has brought experience and leadership to the Saints secondary. He was originally selected by the Arizona Cardinals in the third round (69th overall) in the 2013 NFL Draft out of LSU and has played for the Cardinals (2013-17), Houston Texans (2018), Kansas City Chiefs (2019-21) and Saints (2022-). In 11 NFL seasons, he has played in 163 regular season games with 154 starts and has posted career totals of 772 tackles (634 solo), 42 stops for loss, 11 sacks for a loss of 78 yards, 33 interceptions for 502 return yards, four brought back for touchdowns, 99 passes defensed, five forced fumbles, seven fumble recoveries and five special teams stops. Mathieu has been selected to three Pro Bowls, three Associated Press All-Pro teams and the Pro Football Hall of Fame's 2010's All-Decade Team.

In his second season in New Orleans in 2023, Mathieu opened all 17 contests for the second consecutive campaign and finished with 75 tackles (50 solo), four interceptions, tied for seventh in the NFL and the team lead, returned for 122 yards with a TD and nine passes defensed.

Mathieu's 33 interceptions since coming into the NFL in 2013 are tied for first in the league over the period after tying for the club lead with four picks in 2023.

CB MARSHON LATTIMORE

Selected by the Saints in the first round (11th overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft Lattimore started all 13 games he appeared in. He totaled 53 tackles (44 solo), a forced fumble, one fumble recovery, five interceptions for 85 yards and 18 passes defensed. As a rookie, Lattimore became the youngest Saint (21 years old) ever selected to the Pro Bowl and was voted as the AP NFL Defensive Bookie of the Year.

In seven seasons, Lattimore has started all 90 regular season games he has appeared in, recording 375 tackles (304 solo), 15 interceptions, 86 passes deensed, five forced fumbles and five fumble recoveries, earning Pro Bowl honors in four seasons.

To open the 2023 season, Lattimore came up with a standout performance in the opening win over Tennessee. In addition to his 15th career pick, to move him into a tie for eighth place in club record books in interceptions, he also finished with four passes defnesed, the third time in his career he has deflected at least four throws in a contest. In a season cut short by an ankle injury, he started the first ten games and posted 48 stops, one pick and eight passes defensed.

GET A HAND ON

Lattimore's 86 passes defensed since entering the NFL in 2017 are ranked first in the league.

CB PAULSON ADEBO

New Orleans' third round selection (76th overall) in the 2021 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Adebo overcame not playing college football in 2020 to make significant contributions to the Saints secondary in his first season with the club. The Texas native finished his college career playing in 22 games with 21 starts for Stanford and recording 97 tackles, 34 passes defensed and eight interceptions, earning All-Pac 12 honors in both 2018 and 2019.

Joining the starting lineup immediately as a rookie in 2021, Adebo has played in 45 games with 44 starts, posting 199 tackles, seven interceptions, 33 passes defensed, two forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and two special teams stops.

Sharpened by an extensive training camp competition, Adebo enjoyed a breakout 2023 campaign. His season was highlighted by a two interception, three total takeaway performance in the Nov. 5, 24-17 win over Chicago that earned him NFC Defensive Player of the Week. Adebo finished with 76 tackles to lead the secondary, four interceptions, tied for first on the team with Mathieu, 18 passes defensed to rank third in the league, two forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries, also adding a pick on a two-point attempt in the Dec. 31, 23-13 win at Tampa Bay.

ALONTAE TAYLOR

Selected by the Saints in the second round (49th overall) of the 2022 NFL Draft out of Tennessee, Taylor shook off early injuries to play in 13 games with nine starts and posted 45 tackles (38 solo) and a club-best 11 passes defensed, ranked fourth among NFL rookies.

Moving to the nickel position in 2023, possessing extensive experience on the inside and the outside, Taylor appeared in all 17 games with 13 starts and recorded 75 tackles, his first two career interceptions in the last two weeks of the season and a career-high 14 passes deensed, tied for second on the team and ninth in the NFL.

BREAKING UP

In 2022, Taylor was the first rookie since Lattimore to lead the Saints in passes defensed [11], and only the fourth in team history to do so (Saints did not track passes defensed before 1980). He followed that up by finishing tied for second on the team with 14 in 2023.
