**ALL-TIME SERIES**

New Orleans leads the all-time series, 32-20, and the Saints lead the series, 19-13, as NFC South rivals, with the two teams splitting the series in each of the past three seasons (2015-17). The Saints swept the Buccaneers from 2012-14, but the Buccaneers swept both contests in 2005 and 2007 before splitting each series from 2008-11, including a 10-3 victory in 2005 in a road contest played in Baton Rouge and a 27-13 win in the 2005 regular season home finale, a victory that clinched the NFC South title for the Buccaneers. Prior to joining the NFC South, Tampa Bay had claimed three of the previous four meetings, including wins in both 1999 and 2001. The Bucs won the first game between the two clubs, a 33-14 triumph at the Superdome in 1977. Tampa Bay tied an NFL record, which has since been broken, by returning three interceptions for touchdowns. The victory marked the Bucs' first regular season win after 26 consecutive losses. More than 8,000 fans greeted the team upon its return to One Buccaneer Place. Tampa Bay and New Orleans split the next four meetings, each winning two straight on the other team's turf before the Saints assembled a six-game winning streak.

## WHAT TO WATCH FOR

### **Team**

- Tampa Bay has 5,500 yards in each of the past three seasons, the longest such streak in team history. With at least 5,500 yards in 2018, the team would extend that record.
- Tampa Bay has scored at least 325 points in each of the past three seasons, the longest such streak in team history. With at least 325 points in 2018, the team would extend that record.

### **TE Cameron Brate**

- Brate has 17 career touchdown catches. He needs one more to pass Gerald Carter (17 from 1981-87) and Keyshawn Johnson (17 from 2000-03) for 10th-most, three more to tie Vincent Jackson (20 from 2012-16) for ninth-most and eight more to tie Bruce Hill (23 from 1987-91) for the eighth-most touchdown receptions in team history.
- Brate has 129 career receptions. He needs one more to pass Alex Smith (129 from 2005-08) for sixth-most, nine more to pass Jackie Harris (137 from 1994-97) for fifth-most and 56 more to pass Dave Moore (184 from 1992-2001, 2004-06) for the fourth-most receptions by a tight end in team history.
- Brate has 1,556 career receiving yards. He needs 79 more to pass Jackie Harris (1,634 from 1994-97) for fifth-most and 250 more to pass Dave Moore (1,805 from 1992-2001, 2004-06) for the fourth-most receiving yards by a tight end in team history.
- Brate's 1,556 career receiving yards are the second-most by an undrafted player in franchise history. He needs 145 more to pass Karl Williams (1,700 from 1996-2003) for the most receiving yards by an undrafted player in team history.

### **LB Lavonte David**

- David has 18.0 career sacks, and needs 11 more to pass Broderick Thomas (26.5 from 1989-93) for the most sacks by a linebacker in franchise history.
- David has 10 career interceptions, and needs one more to pass Dave Lewis (10 from 1977-81) for second-most, and 15 more to tie Derrick Brooks (25 from 1995-2008) for the most interceptions by a linebacker in franchise history.
- David has 11 career fumble recoveries, tied for the third-most in team history. He needs one more to pass John Cannon (11 from 1982-90) for second-most, and tie Ronde Barber (12 from 1997-2012) for the most fumble recoveries in franchise history.
- David has three career defensive touchdowns and needs one more to tie for the third-most in franchise history (David Logan, 1979-96; Mike Washington, 1976-84).

### **WR Mike Evans**

- Evans has surpassed 1,000 receiving yards in each of his first four seasons and, with 1,000 or more receiving yards in 2018, will join A.J. Green (2011-15) and Randy Moss (1998-2002) as the only players in NFL history to record 1,000 or more receiving yards in each of their first five seasons. Evans would extend his team record for 1,000-yard receiving seasons and consecutive 1,000 yard receiving seasons.
- Evans has recorded 4,579 receiving yards in his first four seasons. This season he needs 1,163 to pass Sterling Sharpe (5,741 from 1988-92) for 10th-most, 1,282 to pass T.Y. Hilton (5,861 from 2012-16) for ninth-most, 1,287 to pass DeAndre Hopkins (5,865 from 2013-17) for eighth-most, 1,294 to pass Calvin Johnson (5,872 from 2007-11) for seventh-most and 1,397 to pass Larry Fitzgerald (5,975 from 2004-08) for the sixth-most receiving yards in a players' first five seasons since the 1970 NFL/AFL merger.
- Evans has recorded 4,579 career receiving yards and needs 350 more to pass Kevin House (4,928 from 1980-86) for second-most and 440 more to pass Mark Carrier (5,018 from 1987-92) for the most receiving yards in franchise history.
- Evans has 32 career receiving touchdowns and needs two more to tie Jimmie Giles (34 from 1978-86) for the most receiving touchdowns in franchise history.
- Evans has 32 touchdowns from scrimmage as a Buccaneer and needs two more to tie Jimmie Giles (34 from 1978-86) for third-most and 15 more to tie James Wilder (46 from 1981-89) for the second-most touchdowns in franchise history.
- Evans has recorded 309 career receptions and needs 13 more to pass Mark Carrier (321 from 1987-92) for second-most and 122 more to pass James Wilder (430 from 1981-89) for the most receptions in franchise history.

### **WR DeSean Jackson**

- Jackson has 33 career 100-yard receiving games, the fourth-most of any active player and the fifth-most by any player since he entered the league in 2008.
- Jackson has 49 receiving touchdowns in his career and needs one touchdown more to reach 50 for his career.
- Jackson has four receiving touchdowns of 80 or more yards and needs one more to tie the NFL record of five, shared by Derrick Alexander, Lance Alworth, Bob Hayes and Jerry Rice.
- Jackson has 22 touchdowns of 60 or more yards (including returns) and needs one more to tie Jerry Rice (23) for the most total touchdowns of 60 or more yards in NFL history.
- Jackson has 26 career touchdowns of 50 or more yards and needs one more to tie Terrell Owens (27) for the third-most total touchdowns of 50 or more yards since the 1970 NFL merger.

### **DT Gerald McCoy**

- McCoy has six career multi-sack games and needs one more to Broderick Thomas (seven from 1989-1993) for the fourth-most in franchise history and pass David Logan (six from 1979-86) for the second-most by a defensive tackle in team history.

CB **Mike Washington** (45 yards), LB **Richard Wood** (10) and DE **Greg Johnson** (0) returned interceptions for scores in 33-14 Bucs win (12/11/77), the first in franchise history... Saints scored 42 unanswered points — all in the second half — en route to 42-14 win at Tampa Stadium (10/14/79)... New Orleans scored five of its six TDs on the ground, rushing for 234 yards on 48 carries... QB **Doug Williams** threw for 218 yards and two TDs in 31-14 road win (11/29/81)... Teams combined for 600 passing yards in 44-34 Saints win at the Superdome (12/6/87)... WR **Mark Carrier** caught five passes for 120 yards, helping the Bucs snap six-game series skid with a 20-10 win (9/24/89)... K **Morten Andersen** booted a 50-yard FG to lift New Orleans to a 23-21 victory (11/1/92)... Rookie FB **Mike Alstott** caught seven passes for 91 yards, including a 17-yard TD in 13-7 Bucs victory (11/24/96)... The Bucs snapped a nine-game road losing streak in the series with a 31-16 victory at New Orleans (11/7/99)... Tampa Bay tied the club's single-game record for points scored in a 48-21 victory over New Orleans at Raymond James Stadium (12/23/01)... CB **Ronde Barber** set a club record (later tied) with three interceptions, including a 36-yard return for a touchdown on his final interception, as the Bucs picked off Saints QB **Aaron Brooks** four times... New Orleans LB **James Allen** intercepted a desperation pass from P **Tom Tupa** in the end zone on a botched punt to lead the Saints to a 26-20 overtime win in head coach **Jon Gruden's** debut (9/8/02)... Trailing late in the fourth quarter, Tampa Bay posted a frantic 10-point comeback to send the game into overtime... WR **Joe Jurevicius** made a one-handed grab for an 11-yard TD with 2:41 on the clock and Gramatica nailed a 40-yard field goal as time expired to force the extra period... TE **Ken Dilger** and DT **Warren Sapp**, who was playing tight end at the time, both caught touchdowns as the Bucs won 14-7 at New Orleans (12/7/03)... QB **Chris Simms** made his first career start in the NFL at New Orleans (10/10/04) and completed 5-of-8 pass attempts for 68 yards before leaving the game because of injury late in the first quarter... Backup QB **Brian Griese** relieved Simms and led the Buccaneers to a 20-17 win by completing 16-of-19 pass attempts for 194 yards and one touchdown... CB **Ronde Barber** recorded his second three-interception game of his career against the Saints in Baton Rouge (12/4/05)... Tampa Bay clinched the NFC South title with a 27-13 win vs. New Orleans (1/1/06)... WR **Joey Galloway** caught a pair of touchdown passes, his ninth and 10th of the season to set a new team record... Saints RB **Reggie Bush** scored his first career touchdown on a 65-yard punt return late in the fourth quarter to give New Orleans (10/8/06) a 24-21 win in New Orleans... After losing its first game of the season on the road, Tampa Bay was able to defeat New Orleans (9/16/07) 31-14 at home for their first of nine wins on the season en route to the 2007 NFC South division title... The Buccaneers all but sealed up the 2007 NFC South Championship after they were able to leave New Orleans (12/2/07) with 27-23 come from behind victory... Trailing 23-20 with 3:36 remaining in the fourth quarter, DT **Jovan Haye** was able to recover a RB **Reggie Bush** fumble on New Orleans 37-yard line... After marching down the field, QB **Luke McCown** found TE **Jerramy Stevens** in the end zone with just 14 seconds remaining in the game to give Tampa the win... The Buccaneers defense intercepted Saints QB **Drew Brees** three times in 23-20 defeat of the Saints to give Gruden his 100th career victory (11/30/08)... PR **Micheal Spurlock** return a punt 77 yards for a touchdown, as the Buccaneers erased a 17-3 halftime deficit to knock off the Saints 20-17 at Superdome ...

RB **Carnell Williams** rushed 24 times for 129 yards and a touchdown as K **Connor Barth** hit the game-winning 47-yard field goal in overtime (12/27/09)... WR **Micheal Spurlock** caught a two yard touchdown pass in the second half during a 31-6 loss to the Saints (10/17/10)... QB **Josh Freeman** went 21-of-26 for 255 yards and two touchdowns as the Buccaneers defeated the Saints at New Orleans, finishing the season 10-6 (1/2/11)... The Buccaneers forced four turnovers, including intercepting QB **Drew Brees** three times, en route to a 26-20 victory over the Saints at Raymond James Stadium (10/16/11)... QB **Josh Freeman** threw for 303 yards, two touchdowns and zero interceptions, while RB **Earnest Graham** picked up 109 yards on the ground for Tampa Bay... The Saints never trailed in a 27-16 victory over the Buccaneers in New Orleans (11/6/11)... Saints QB **Drew Brees** led the way for New Orleans, completing 27-of-37 passes for 281 yards, two touchdowns and one interception... In a high-scoring affair, the Saints held on to beat the Buccaneers 35-28 in Tampa (10/21/12) on the strength of 337 passing yards and four touchdowns from QB **Drew Brees**... The Buccaneers staged a late comeback but fell short as WR **Mike Williams** apparent game-tying touchdown catch was nullified by a penalty as time expired... The Buccaneers fell to the Saints road 41-0 on the road (12/16/12)... Tampa Bay's defense allowed 447 yards of total offense, while QB Josh Freeman threw four interceptions (12/16/12)... RB **Doug Martin** rushed for 144 yards on 29 attempts, but the Buccaneers lost in the final seconds, 16-14, on a Saints field goal (9/15/13)... LB **Mason Foster** returned an interception 85 yards for a touchdown in the fourth quarter of the loss... The Saints topped the Buccaneers 42-17 in the 2013 season finale between the two teams (12/29/13)... Both teams traded scores in a back-and-forth contest in the Superdome, with the Saints prevailing 37-31 in overtime (10/5/14)... WR **Vincent Jackson** caught eight passes for 144 yards... The Buccaneers intercepted Saints QB **Drew Brees** three times, including a 33-yard pick-six by LB **Danny Lansanah**... The Saints managed to overcome a 20-7 deficit, scoring 16 fourth-quarter points to win 23-20 (12/28/14)... Tampa Bay rushed for 183 yards, including 108 from RB **Doug Martin**... WR **Mike Evans** caught his 12th touchdown of the season, establishing a new franchise record... The defense intercepted Drew Brees three times (CB **Leonard Johnson**, S **Bradley McDougald** and S **Keith Tandy** each with one)... Tampa Bay's defense forced three turnovers and QB **Jameis Winston** accounted for two touchdowns (one rushing, one passing) as the Buccaneers recorded a 26-19 victory in New Orleans (9/20/15)... DE **Jacques Smith** notched 3.0 sacks and two forced fumbles... New Orleans QB **Drew Brees** threw for 312 yards and two touchdowns, both to WR **Marques Colston**, in a 24-17 Saints victory (12/13/15)... Tampa Bay's defense recorded three interceptions, including one by S **Keith Tandy** with under a minute to go, to help the team earn a 16-11 win at Raymond James Stadium... New Orleans RB **Mark Ingram** had two rushing touchdowns in a 31-24 Saints victory (12/24/16)... New Orleans totaled 407 yards in a 30-10 home victory, paced by RB **Alvin Kamara's** 152 yard from scrimmage (11/5/17)... QB **Jameis Winton** connected with WR **Chris Godwin** on a 39-yard touchdown pass with nine seconds remaining to give the Buccaneers a 31-24 victory (12/31/17)... Godwin was named NFC Offensive Player of the Week after catching seven passes for 111 yards and the game-winning touchdown... WR **Adam Humphries** also had over 100 yards, finishing the game with seven catches for 102 yards.

**LB Kwon Alexander:** In five career games against New Orleans, has 43 tackles (one for loss) and four passes defended.

**P Bryan Anger:** Punted three times for 150 yards (50.0 avg.), with two downed inside the 20 and a net average of 49.7 (12/27/15)... Placed his final two punts of the game inside the Saints' five-yard line (12/11/16).

**TE Cam Brate:** Caught a 12-yard touchdown (12/24/16).

**S Chris Conte:** Totaled four tackles, one tackle for loss, one forced fumble and an interception in a Buccaneers win (9/20/15).

**LB Lavonte David:** Combined for 83 tackles, 12 for loss, nine passes defended, 2.5 sacks and two forced fumbles in 12 career games against the Saints... Registered 1.5 sacks to go along with six tackles and two passes defended (9/15/13)... In an overtime loss (10/5/14), led all players with 14 tackles... Notched 13 tackles and two passes defended (12/13/15)... Notched seven tackles and one sack (12/24/16)... Forced a fumble that was recovered by the Buccaneers, along with tallying seven tackles (one for loss) and a pass defended (11/5/17).

**WR Mike Evans:** Caught his 12th touchdown pass of the season, establishing a new franchise record (12/28/14)... Had seven catches for 97 yards and a touchdown (12/24/16).

**WR Chris Godwin:** Recovered a fumbled punt, setting up a Buccaneers touchdown (11/5/17)... Named NFC Offensive Player of the Week after catching seven passes for 111 yards and the game-winning touchdown (12/31/17).

**CB Brent Grimes:** As a member of the Atlanta Falcons, grabbed an interception and had two passes defended (11/2/09)... Had five tackles and one interception in a Falcons win at New Orleans (9/26/10)... Recorded an interception in win (12/11/16).

**WR Adam Humphries:** Caught first career touchdown against New Orleans (12/13/15)... Had seven catches for 102 yards in a Buccaneers victory (12/31/17).

**CB Vernon Hargreaves:** Registered his first career interception against New Orleans (12/11/16).

**WR DeSean Jackson:** As a member of the Philadelphia Eagles, caught four passes for 101 yards, including a 71-yard touchdown (9/20/09)... Recorded three receptions for 100 yards, with a 77-yard touchdown, as a member of the Eagles (11/5/12).

**DT Gerald McCoy:** Has played 13 career games against New Orleans (2010-17), totaling 31 tackles, five tackles for loss, four passes defended and 2.5 sacks.

**RB Jacquizz Rodgers:** Totaled 78 yards from scrimmage (63 rushing yards, 15 receiving yards), with a rushing touchdown.

**CB Ryan Smith:** Blocked an extra point and led the team with nine tackles (11/5/17).

Dirk Koetter was named the 11th head coach in franchise history on January 15, 2016, after serving as offensive coordinator in 2015.

Since joining Tampa Bay, Koetter has helped guide the Buccaneers to one of the NFL's top offenses, ranking seventh in yards per game (361.9), having the third-highest third-down conversion rate (43.0 pct.) and totaling the fifth-most first downs (1,028) during that timeframe.

Tampa Bay has tallied three of the top four offensive seasons in franchise history under Koetter's leadership, while also registering three of the top 10 seasons in scoring offense. The Buccaneers are one of only five teams to record at least 5,500 yards and 335 points in each of the past three seasons (also Atlanta Falcons, New England Patriots, New Orleans Saints and Pittsburgh Steelers).

Despite injuries at the quarterback position in 2017, Koetter's offense still produced the most passing yards in franchise history (4,366), along with the most first downs (352) and the most passing first downs (243), as well as the highest yards per attempt (7.61). The Buccaneers finished the 2017 season leading the league in passing first downs, ranking second in total first downs, fourth in net passing yards per game (272.9) and third down conversion rate (43.4 pct.) and tying for the 10th-most passing touchdowns (26).

While a shoulder injury forced quarterback Jameis Winston to miss the first playing time of his career, he still managed to post career bests in completion percentage (63.8 pct.), yards per attempt (7.9) and passer rating (92.2), while posting a career-low interception rate (2.5 pct.). His 7.93 yards per attempt set a single-season franchise record and his six 300-yard passing games were the most in a single season in team history. Winston also ranked in the top five in franchise history in single-season passer rating. He averaged 269.5 passing yards per game, which was the sixth-highest mark in the NFL. He also ranked fourth in both yards per attempt and yards per completion (12.43). Winston finished his third season with the third-most passing yards by a player from their rookie season through their third season, trailing only Andrew Luck and Peyton Manning, while registering the seventh-most passing touchdowns.

In his first season as an NFL head coach, Koetter led Tampa Bay to a 9-7 record, the team's most wins since 2010 and the second-most wins by any coach in their first season with the Buccaneers (Jon Gruden – 12). The Buccaneers set a franchise record for third-down conversion rate in 2016 at 43.9 pct.

In 2016, Koetter continued to help with the development of quarterback Jameis Winston, who set single-season franchise records for passing yards (4,090) and passing touchdowns (28). Winston became the youngest player to throw for 50 touchdowns in NFL history and the first player in league history to throw for at least 4,000 yards in each of his first two seasons.

Much of Winston's success in 2016 came from throwing to wide receiver Mike Evans, who earned his first career Pro Bowl nod after recording 96 catches for 1,321 yards and 12 touchdowns. His 12 touchdown receptions tied Evans' own franchise record and tied for the second-most in the NFL in 2016, while his 1,321 receiving yards were the third-most in a season in team history and the fourth-most in the league that season. Evans' 96 receptions are the second-most ever by a Buccaneer and ranked sixth in the NFL in 2016.

The 2016 season also saw a breakout performance from tight end Cameron Brate, who tied for the NFL lead in touchdown catches by a tight end, with eight, which matched the highest mark ever by a Buccaneers tight end (Jimmie Giles, 1985). Brate was second on the team in both receptions (57) and receiving yards (660), both of which ranked in the top 10 in Buccaneers history for tight ends.

Koetter's first season also saw a defensive improvement, with the Buccaneers recording 29 takeaways, the third-highest mark in the NFL and an improvement from 23 the previous season. After allowing 26.1 points per game in 2015 (26th in the league), the 2016 team allowed only 23.1 points per game (15th in the league). Tampa Bay punter Bryan Anger also had the best punting season in team history in 2016, setting franchise records for punts inside the 20 (37 – tied for the third-most in the NFL) and net punting average (42.7, the fourth-best mark in the NFL).

In his first season with Tampa Bay (2015), Koetter helped pilot one of the most successful offenses in the NFL and one of the best in team history. The team set the franchise record for total yards (6,014 – 357.0 per game), while posting the second-most rushing yards (2,162 – 135.1 per game), the then-second-most passing yards (3,852 – 240.8 per game), along with the then-fifth-most total points (342 – 21.4 per game). Tampa Bay ranked fifth in the NFL in yards per game (375.9), fifth in rushing yards per game (135.1) and second in the league in rush average (4.75). It marked the first time in franchise history that the Buccaneers have finished in the top five in total offense.

Much of Tampa Bay's offensive success in 2015 came at the hands of rookie quarterback Jameis Winston, who accounted for 28 total touchdowns (22 passing, six rushing). Koetter also helped guide Winston to 4,042 passing yards, which were the second-most in a single season in team history and then the third-most by a rookie in NFL history. Winston's 22 passing touchdowns were tied for the fourth-most in a single season in team history and the fourth-most by a rookie in NFL history. His six rushing touchdowns and 28 combined touchdowns were the most in a single season by a Buccaneers quarterback, while his 28 total touchdowns were tied for the third-most by a rookie in NFL history.

Prior to Koetter's arrival, the Buccaneers ranked 29th in rushing and tied for 29th in sacks allowed in 2014. In 2015, under Koetter's guidance, the unit completed an impressive turnaround. Despite starting two rookies on the offensive line, Tampa Bay still managed to block for the NFL's second-leading rusher (Doug Martin – 1,402 yards) and tied for the fourth-fewest sacks in the league. While Martin was a large part of the team's success running the ball, he was aided by running back Charles Sims, who totaled 1,090 scrimmage yards (107 rushes for 529 yards, 51 catches for 561 yards). Sims averaged 6.9 yards per touch, the most by any player in the NFL with at least 150 touches since 2011 (Darren Sproles in 2011, 7.6 avg.). Martin and Sims' combined 2,566 yards from scrimmage were the most by a running back duo in the NFL in 2015 and set a franchise record for backfield teammates.



Koetter also played a key role in revamping the Buccaneers' passing game. Part of the team's success passing the ball came from targeting top wide receiver Mike Evans, who caught 74 passes for 1,206 yards. His 1,206 yards are the seventh-most in a single season in team history and stood as the 11th-most in the league in 2015. Sims' 561 receiving yards were the fourth-most by a running back in the NFL in 2015, while his four receiving touchdowns set a franchise record and tied for the second-most in the league by a running back.

Koetter joined the Buccaneers after three seasons working as the offensive coordinator for the Atlanta Falcons (2012-14). During his three seasons with Atlanta, the team cumulatively ranked second in the NFL in completion percentage (67.4), third in third-down conversion percentage (44.1), fourth in passing yards (277.2 per game), ninth in passing touchdowns (86), ninth in passer rating (93.9), 10th in points (24.0 per game) and 10th in total yardage (363.5 per game), while posting the second-fewest penalties (243) and penalty yards (2,043), seventh-fewest turnovers (69) and the ninth-lowest interception percentage (2.4) in the league. Koetter was part of the Falcons staff that went 13-3 in 2012 and played in the NFC Championship Game.

Under Koetter, Falcons quarterback Matt Ryan posted three of the four highest passing yardage seasons in franchise history to that point, as well as three of the five highest completion percentage seasons. In 2012, Ryan set then-franchise records and personal bests in passing yards (4,719), completion percentage (68.6) and passing touchdowns (32), while recording the second-highest passer rating mark in Falcons history (99.1). Atlanta wide receivers also flourished under Koetter, with Julio Jones setting a then-franchise record and ranking third in the NFL in receiving yards in 2014 with 1,593 yards. In those three seasons, the Falcons had a different player lead the team in receiving yards each season (Roddy White, 2012; Harry Douglas, 2013; Jones, 2014).

While Koetter was in charge of the Falcons' offense, he coached three players to Pro Bowl appearances (Julio Jones, 2012, 2014; Tony Gonzalez, 2012-13; Matt Ryan, 2012), with Gonzalez earning first-team All-Pro honors in 2012. In his first season with Koetter in 2012, Gonzalez set a franchise record for receiving yards by a tight end, recording 93 catches for 930 yards – the most he had recorded in either category since 2008. That same season, Jones and White combined for 2,549 receiving yards, the most by a duo in the NFL.

Prior to joining the Falcons, Koetter spent five seasons as the offensive coordinator of the Jacksonville Jaguars (2007-11). In his five years with the Jaguars, the team cumulatively ranked third in the NFL in rushing yards (132.0 per game) and sixth in rushing average (4.41). Koetter's Jacksonville offenses also showed a penchant for taking care of the football, tallying the seventh-fewest turnovers in the league during that time.

Koetter had immediate success in Jacksonville, with his 2007 team setting franchise records in points (25.7 per game, sixth in the NFL) and total offense (357 yards per game, seventh in the NFL). In his first season as the starter, quarterback David Garrard ranked third in the NFL and set a franchise record in passer rating (102.2), throwing a league-low three interceptions, while leading the team to a Wild Card playoff berth and a win over the Pittsburgh Steelers. In 2008, Garrard threw for a career-best 3,620 yards and in 2010 he tossed 23 touchdowns, a career high and a franchise record.

While with the Jaguars, Koetter coached four different players to six Pro Bowl selections, including running back Maurice Jones-Drew, who earned three trips to the Pro Bowl and led the NFL in rushing in 2010 en route to earning an All-Pro selection. Koetter also helped tight end Mercedes Lewis earn a Pro Bowl berth following the 2010 season, when Lewis caught 10 touchdown passes, then tied for the most in a season in Jaguars history.

Before joining the Jaguars, Koetter spent 22 years at the collegiate level, the final six as the head coach at Arizona State (2001-06). In his six seasons with the Sun Devils, Koetter led the team to four bowl games, posting a 40-34 record. Working as both the head coach and offensive coordinator, he helped Arizona State average nearly 30 points per game over six seasons, while ranking in the top 20 in the nation in passing offense in five of his six years. In addition, five of the six Sun Devil teams during Koetter's tenure produced a 1,000-yard receiver and quarterbacks that threw for 20 or more touchdowns in five of six seasons.

Koetter's first head coaching opportunity came at Boise State, where he spent three seasons (1998-2000), finishing with a 26-10 record and two consecutive bowl wins. He was a two-time Big West Coach of the Year and two-time conference champion.

A native of Pocatello, Idaho, Koetter played collegiately at Idaho State (1978-81), helping his team to a Division I-AA national championship as a senior. He graduated with a bachelor's degree in physical education and earned a master's in athletic administration a year later. After getting his master's, he became the head coach at Highland (Idaho) High School, where he worked from 1983-84, going 19-4 and winning the 1984 state championship.

In 1985, Koetter worked as the offensive coordinator at San Francisco State and from 1986-88 was the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at the University of Texas El-Paso. He then served as offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach at Missouri from 1989-93 and offensive coordinator at Boston College (1994-95) and Oregon (1996-97).

Koetter, 59, and his wife, Kim, have two daughters, Kaylee and Kendra, and two sons, Derek and Davis.

## SEAN PAYTON



Since he was hired as head coach of the New Orleans Saints in 2006, Sean Payton has established himself as one of the most successful coaches in the NFL. Payton has led the Saints to six playoff berths, four NFC South division titles and the franchise's first World Championship with a 31-17 win over the Indianapolis Colts in Super Bowl XLIV.

Payton has a 112-76 overall record (.596), including a 7-5 postseason mark (.583) after the franchise had won only one playoff game prior to his arrival. Payton holds the franchise's top win total and winning percentage.

Payton is one of just eight active coaches to lead a team to a Super Bowl victory. The others are New England's Bill Belichick, Seattle's Pete Carroll, Oakland's Jon Gruden (with Tampa Bay in 2002), Baltimore's John Harbaugh, Green Bay's Mike McCarthy, Philadelphia's Doug Pederson and Pittsburgh's Mike Tomlin.

Payton has presided over the NFL's most prolific offense since his arrival, leading the league in net yards per game in 2006, 2008, 2009, 2011, 2014 and 2016 and finishing first in scoring in 2008 and 2009. The team has ranked in the top 10 offensively every season since Payton has arrived.

Payton was hired as the 14th head coach in Saints history on Jan. 18, 2006 after serving as a member of the Dallas Cowboys coaching staff from 2003-05 under 2013 Pro Football Hall of Fame inductee Bill Parcells. Prior to his final season with the Cowboys, Payton was promoted to assistant head coach/passing game coordinator and was responsible for the team's play-calling after serving as assistant head coach/quarterbacks from 2003-04.

Payton went to Dallas following four years with the New York Giants (1999-2002), the last three as offensive coordinator after spending his first season as quarterbacks coach.

Payton wrapped two coaching stints at San Diego State University (1988-89 and 1992-93) around a stop at Indiana State (1990-91). During his second stretch with the Aztecs, Payton was running backs coach, working with Heisman Trophy runner-up Marshall Faulk before becoming quarterbacks coach.

Following the 1993 season, Payton moved to Miami (Ohio) (1994-95) where he was quarterbacks coach. He spent 1996 as quarterbacks coach at Illinois before entering the NFL with Philadelphia.

Payton earned a bachelor's degree in communications at Eastern Illinois, where as a quarterback he had 10,665 passing yards, then the third-highest total in NCAA Division I-AA history. The three-time AP All-American selection had professional stints with Chicago of the Arena Football League, Ottawa of the Canadian Football League and the Chicago Bears in 1987. Payton was inducted into the Eastern Illinois Hall of Fame in September of 2000 and had his jersey retired in a ceremony in September of 2010. He received an honorary doctorate from his alma mater in 2013.

Payton was born Dec. 29, 1963 in San Mateo, Calif., and raised in Naperville, Ill., Payton has a daughter, Meghan and a son, Connor.

## JASON LIGHT

Jason Licht was named the fifth general manager of the Tampa Bay Buccaneers on January 21, 2014. Now in his 22nd NFL season, including one as a coach, Licht has had a proven track record of success. Since joining the Miami Dolphins front office in 1995, teams that Licht has been a part of have won over 53 percent of their games, including eight seasons with double-digit victories, while making nine playoff appearances and winning eight division titles, four conference championships and one Super Bowl title. DT **Beau Allen** joins Tampa Bay after spending his first four seasons with the Philadelphia Eagles (2014-17), including winning Super Bowl LII. In his four-year career, Allen has played in 63 regular season games, with eight starts, registering 87 tackles, including 10 for loss, 2.0 sacks and a fumble recovery, which he returned 10 yards. He also played in all three postseason games in 2017, en route to Philadelphia's Super Bowl LII championship.

In 2017, Allen was part of a defense that allowed the fewest rushing yards per game (79.2), the sixth-lowest yards per carry (3.76) and tied for the third-fewest rushing touchdowns (seven).



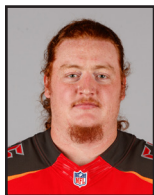
K **Chandler Catanzaro** joins Tampa Bay after spending the 2017 season with the New York Jets. He originally entered the league as a college free agent and spent his first three seasons (2014-16) with the Arizona Cardinals. In his career, Catanzaro has made 103-of-122 field goals attempted (84.4 pct.).

Since entering the league in 2014, Catanzaro has the eighth-most made field goals in the NFL (103) and the seventh-most points (461) during that span. In 2015, he tied a Cardinals record with 53 extra points made and finished third in the NFL with 137 points. In 2017, Catanzaro had a 67.2 touchback percentage on kickoffs, which ranked seventh in the NFL and was the highest by a Jets kicker since 1994, when Stats, Inc. first began tracking touchback percentage.



DE **Vinny Curry** joins the Buccaneers after playing for the Philadelphia Eagles in his first six seasons (2012-17). In his career, Curry has played in 84 regular season games, with 16 starts, totaling 130 tackles, 33 tackles for loss, 22.0 sacks, five forced fumbles, two passes defended and one fumble recovery.

In 2017, Curry started all 16 regular season games for Philadelphia, as well as all three Super Bowl contests, en route to Philadelphia's Super Bowl LII championship. Curry, along with recently signed Buccaneers defensive tackle Beau Allen, was part of a defense that allowed the fewest rushing yards per game (79.2), the sixth-lowest yards per carry (3.76) and tied for the third-fewest rushing touchdowns allowed (seven).



C **Ryan Jensen** comes to Tampa Bay after spending his first five seasons with the Baltimore Ravens (2013-17). Originally a sixth-round pick (203rd overall) in the 2013 NFL Draft, Jensen played in 35 regular season games for the Ravens, with 25 starts, including starting all 16 games for Baltimore in 2017.

Last season, Jensen was part of an offensive line that tied for the seventh-fewest sacks allowed (27) in the NFL, while rushing for 116.0 yards per game, the 11th-highest mark in the league. Jensen helped block for Ravens running back Alex Collins, who averaged 4.59 yards per carry, the ninth-highest mark in the NFL.

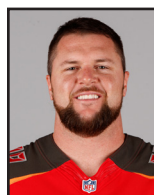


DE **Jason Pierre-Paul** comes to Tampa Bay after spending his first eight seasons with the Giants (2010-17), starting 85-of-111 regular season games, totaling 423 tackles, 87 for loss, 58.5 sacks, 47 passes defended, 13 forced fumbles, seven fumble recoveries — including a 43-yard fumble returned for a touchdown — and two interceptions, both returned for touchdowns. Pierre-Paul also started all four games in the 2011 postseason for New York, recording 18 tackles, four passes defended and a half-sack in helping the Giants win Super Bowl XLVI.

Last season, Pierre-Paul led the Giants with 8.5 sacks, the fourth time in his eight seasons that he led the team in sacks. In 2011, Pierre-Paul totaled 16.5 sacks, the fourth-most in a single season in Giants history, en route to earning Pro Bowl and Associated Press first-team All-Pro honors. His 16.5 sacks that season are the fourth-most in a single season in Giants history, while his 86 tackles and 23 tackles for loss each led NFL defensive linemen that season. Pierre-Paul also earned a Pro Bowl berth following the 2012 season, when he led the Giants in sacks (6.5) and scored his first career touchdown, a 28-yard interception return.

Since 2010, Pierre-Paul has three return touchdowns (two interceptions, one fumble recovery), which is tied for the most among all defensive linemen. His 47 passes defended are tied with J.J. Watt for the most by a defensive lineman in that span. Pierre-Paul's 423 tackles since entering the league are tied for the second-most by a defensive lineman, while his 87 tackles for loss are fifth among defensive lineman and 12th in the NFL during that time.

In his career, Pierre-Paul has been named NFC Defensive Player of the Week four times, trailing only Hall of Famers Lawrence Taylor (9) and Michael Strahan (5) for the most in Giants history. Pierre-Paul was also named NFC Defensive Player of the Month in December 2011.



DL **Mitch Unrein** has played in 95 career regular season games, with 24 starts, totaling 125 tackles, 4.5 sacks and one fumble recovery. Unrein comes to Tampa Bay from the Chicago Bears, where he has played since 2015.

After entering the league as a college free agent with the Houston Texans in 2010, Unrein spent time on the Denver Broncos' practice squad before being promoted to the active roster and playing four seasons in Denver (2011-14), including as part of the Broncos' 2013 AFC Champion team that played in Super Bowl XLVIII. Following his time in Denver, Unrein played two games for the San Diego Chargers in 2015, before being released and signing with the Bears.



## 2018 DRAFT PICKS



DT **Vita Ve** was chosen 12th overall, out of Washington, where he played in 40 career games, totaling 100 tackles (15 for loss), 9.5 sacks, six passes defended, two forced fumbles and two blocked kicks. In 2017, Ve won the Pac-12 Pat Tillman Defensive Player of the Year Award, as well as the Morris Trophy, given annually to the top defensive lineman in the Pac-12, as voted on by the conference's offensive linemen. He was also a second-team All-American selection by USA Today, Sports Illustrated, SB Nation and TheAthletic.com. The Milpitas, California native was a first-team All-Pac-12 selection by both the league's coaches and the Associated Press in addition to finishing as a Bednarik Award semifinalist.

During his redshirt junior year (2017), Ve started all 13 games, recording 44 tackles (5.5 for loss), four passes defended, 2.5 sacks and a blocked punt. He helped anchor Washington's run defense, which ranked fourth in the NCAA in rushing yards allowed per game (100.9), while allowing only 2.86 yards per carry, the second-lowest mark in the NCAA, trailing only Alabama. Ve was part of a Washington defense that allowed only 16.1 points per game, the fifth-best mark in the country, and surrendered 298.0 yards per game, the eighth-fewest in the NCAA.



RB **Ronald Jones** was chosen 38th overall, out of USC. In three seasons with the Trojans, the McKinney, Texas, native rushed 591 times for 3,619 yards (6.1 avg.) and 39 touchdowns, while adding 32 catches for 301 yards and three touchdowns. In 2017, Jones rushed for 1,550 yards, the eighth-most in the NCAA and the eighth-most in a single season in USC history. He added 19 rushing touchdowns, the fifth-most in the country and tied for the fourth-most in a single season in school history.



CB **M.J. Stewart** was chosen 53rd overall, out of North Carolina. The Arlington, Virginia native totaled 199 tackles (11.5 for loss), 41 passes defended, three forced fumbles, three fumble recoveries and three sacks in his career. Stewart earned honorable mention All-ACC from the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association in both his junior and senior seasons, after being named second-team All-ACC as a sophomore, when he tied for the conference lead with 18 passes defended.



CB **Carlton Davis** was selected 63rd overall, out of Auburn. During his three seasons with the Tigers, Davis started 32-of-38 games, totaling 138 tackles (4.5 for loss), 33 passes defended, four interceptions, three forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. In 2017, Davis was a first-team All-America selection by Sports Illustrated.com and earned second-team All-America honors from Walter Camp, the Associated Press and the American Football Coaches Association, while also being chosen as first-team All-SEC by the league's coaches.



OL **Alex Cappa** was the 94th overall selection in the Draft, out of Humboldt State – the first player drafted from Humboldt State since 1992 (WR Freeman Baysinger, New England). Cappa set a Greater Northwest Athletic Conference record after earning GNAC Offensive Lineman of the Year in each of his four seasons with the Lumberjacks. As a senior in 2017, the Dublin, California native was also a finalist for the Gene Upshaw Award, given annually to the top lineman in NCAA Division II football. Cappa also earned numerous All-American distinctions, including Division II First-Team AP All-American honors as a senior.



S **Jordan Whitehead** was selected 117th overall out of Pittsburgh. In his three seasons with the Panthers, Whitehead started 30-of-31 games, totaling 234 tackles (7.5 for loss), 12 passes defended, three interceptions, three fumble recoveries and two forced fumbles, as well as a half-sack. The Aliquippa, Pennsylvania native also saw time on offense, rushing 43 times for 362 yards (8.4 avg.) and three touchdowns, as well as a two-point conversion rush.



WR **Justin Watson** was chosen with the 144th overall pick out of Penn, where he finished as the school's all-time leader in receptions (286), receiving yards (3,777), receiving touchdowns (33) and all-purpose yards (4,116). He holds single season school records for receptions (89 in 2016), receiving yards (1,115 in 2016) and receiving touchdowns (14 in 2017).



LB **Jack Cichy** was selected 202nd overall out of Wisconsin. In his collegiate career, the Somerset, Wisconsin native played in 24 games, with 11 starts, totaling 120 tackles (15 for loss), 6.5 sacks, six passes defended and two forced fumbles. Cichy missed the 2017 season with an injury. As a redshirt junior in 2016, he was a semifinalist for the Butkus Award, given annually to the best linebacker in college football, while also earning All-Big Ten honorable mention recognition. Cichy was also the 2015 Holiday Bowl Defensive MVP after recording 3.0 sacks against USC – on three consecutive plays.

## HONOR ROLL

Below is a look at awards and honors Buccaneers players received for the 2017 season:

### **LB KWON ALEXANDER**

- **2018 Pro Bowl Selection** - Ranked second on the Buccaneers in tackles, with 97, while tying for the team lead in interceptions, with three. Alexander's three interceptions tied for the most by any linebacker in the NFL last season and he was one of only five players in the league to record at least 95 tackles and three interceptions (also Atlanta linebacker Deion Jones, Carolina linebacker Luke Kuechly, Buffalo cornerback Jordan Poyer and Jacksonville linebacker Telvin Smith). Since entering the league in 2015, Alexander is the only player in the NFL to record at least 300 tackles, 6.0 sacks and six interceptions.

### **TE CAMERON BRATE**

- **Pro Football Focus Team of the Week (Week 6 at ARI, 2017)** - Caught six passes for 76 yards and a touchdown, with five of his six receptions going for a first down.

### **LB LAVONTE DAVID**

- **Pro Football Focus Team of the Week (Week 2 vs. CHI, 2017)** - Led the game with nine tackles, including one tackle for loss, and recovered a fumble that helped set up a Buccaneers touchdown. PFF credited him with a team-high five "defensive stops" in the game.

### **T DEMAR DOTSON**

- **Pro Football Focus Team of the Week (Week 2 vs. CHI, 2017)** - Part of an offensive line that blocked for 117 rushing yards and, per PFF, did not allow any pass pressures in 35 pass attempts.

### **WR MIKE EVANS**

- **Pro Football Focus Team of the Week (Week 7 at BUF, 2017)** - Caught seven passes for 88 yards and a touchdown, earning a first down on all seven catches, with three coming on third down.

### **WR CHRIS GODWIN**

Five of Godwin's seven catches resulted in first downs, tied for the most receiving first downs by an NFC player.

### **C ALI MARPET**

- **Pro Football Focus Team of the Week (Week 6 at ARI, 2017)** - Part of an offensive line that helped block for 414 yards and only allowed one sack and hurry in 49 pass blocking attempts.

### **DT GERALD MCCOY**

- **2018 Pro Bowl Selection** - Led the team in sacks (6.0) tackles for loss (13) and quarterback hits (24). McCoy's 6.0 sacks were tied for the fifth-most by an NFC defensive tackle, while his 13 tackles for loss were second in the NFL among defensive tackles and his 24 quarterback hits ranked 10th in the NFL and second among defensive tackles.
- **Pro Football Focus Team of the Week (Week 11 at MIA, 2017)** - Notched a sack and three quarterback hits, to go along with a season-high seven tackles. PFF credited him with "four total defensive stops."
- **Pro Football Focus Team of the Week (Week 10 vs. NYJ, 2017)** - Tallied two sacks and four total quarterback hits, with two tackles for loss. PFF credited him with "four total defensive stops," helping limit the Jets to just 56 rushing yards.

Dirk Koetter was named the Tampa Bay Buccaneers Offensive Coordinator in 2015, before being elevated to Head Coach in 2016. His three seasons overseeing the Buccaneers offense have produced one of the top offenses both in team history and in the NFL during that span.

## STRENGTH OF THE SOUTH

Over the previous 15 seasons, one could argue that the toughest division in the NFL is the NFC South. Since realignment in 2002, the NFC South is the only division to not only have each of its teams make a conference championship appearance, but have all four teams make it to the Super Bowl. The NFC East, NFC West and AFC West are the only other divisions to have all four teams earn a division championship since realignment.

The NFC South has been represented nine times in a conference championship game, the best in the NFC and the second-most in the NFL. The NFC South is also tied for the second-most appearances in the Super Bowl (5), tied for the most by any NFC division. In 2016, The NFC South became the first division since realignment to have all four of its teams play in the Super Bowl, with Tampa Bay (XXXVII), Atlanta (LI), Carolina (XXXVIII & 50) and New Orleans (XLIV) all making it.

In 2010, the NFC South recorded another impressive feat, as they were the only division to have three teams finish with a winning record, with three of the four teams finish with a double-digit win total (Atlanta – 13-3; New Orleans – 11-5; Tampa Bay – 10-6). It marked just the second time, dating back to realignment in 2002, that a division has had three teams with double-digit wins in the same season (also the AFC South in 2007). The feat was matched by the NFC North in 2012, the NFC West in 2013 and the AFC North in 2014. The NFC South matched this feat again in 2017, becoming the first division to do so twice.

In 2008, the NFC South again showed its overall strength, as it finished as one of only three divisions in the League to have three of its four teams with a record of 9-7 or better (also AFC East and NFC East) and is one of two divisions to have all of its teams at 8-8 or better (also NFC East). The NFC South also finished with a remarkable 27-5 overall home record in 2008, the best combined home winning percentage by a division in NFL history (.844), with the next best division last season, the NFC East, holding an 23-9 record at home. The South was also a near-perfect 11-1 at home when facing other South division opponents in 2008. The Bucs contributed significantly to that mark, as they finished 6-2 at home, winning their first six games at Raymond James Stadium in 2008.
