### THE MATCHUP

The New Orleans Saints [4-7] will be rested and well-prepared after 14 days away from the playing field when they host the Los Angeles Rams [5-6] in their third consecutive home contest in a matchup against their old NFC West foes.

New Orleans got back into the win column for the second consecutive week in Week 11, when they defeated the Cleveland Browns 35-14 on November 17 at the Caesars Superdome. TE **Taysom Hill** enjoyed a standout performance as the Saints rushed for a season-high 214 yards. Hill captured NFC Offensive Player of the Week honors as he rushed seven times for a career-high 138 yards (career-high 19.7 avg.) and tied his career-high with three rushing touchdowns. Hill also had a significant impact in the passing game, as he caught a career-high eight passes for 50 yards and completed a pass for an 18-yard gain. On special teams, he returned a kick-off for 42 yards.

QB **Derek Carr** continued to be a model of efficiency since his return to health from an oblique injury that sidelined him for three contests, completing 21-of-27 passes (77.8 pct.) for 248 yards with touchdown passes to TE **Juwan Johnson** and WR **Marquez Valdes-Scantling** and a 129.6 passer rating. Valdes-Scantling continued his success in stretching the field since his Week Eight acquisition and expansion of his role, catching two passes for 87 yards, including a 71-yard scoring grab, aided by a key block by Johnson. Johnson finished with three receptions for 30 yards, including a fourth quarter one-yard scoring grab. RB **Alvin Kamara** finished with 89 total yards from scrimmage.

The New Orleans defense held an opponent to under 20 points for the second consecutive week, led by a front seven that provided three sacks on the pass rush and held the Browns to only 66 yards rushing on 20 carries (3.6 avg.).

LB **Demario Davis** finished with a season-high 13 tackles and two passes defended. DE **Carl Granderson** finished with four tackles, including two stops for loss and one sack. DT **Bryan Bresee** finished with 1.5 quarterback takedowns to increase his team-leading total to a career-high 5.5.

Special teams, the forte of Interim Head Coach **Darren Rizzi**, also held their own. WR **Dante Pettis** took over punt return duties and had a career-long to 53-yard return. All three of P **Matthew Hayball's** punts dropped inside-the-20-yard line. Second-year LB **Anfernee Orji** finished with two coverage tackles.

## THE HEAD COACHES



In his 32nd year of coaching, his 16th in the National Football League and sixth with the Saints, Darren Rizzi was named interim head coach of the New Orleans Saints on November 4, 2024. Rizzi has coordinated highly successful special teams units for the Miami Dolphins [2010-18] and Saints [2019-present]. He also added assistant head coach responsibilities in 2022 in New Orleans and also had associate head coach duties in Miami from 2017-18.

Rizzi's units have ranked in the top half of NFL writer Rick Gosselin's annual special teams rankings in 12 of the 13 full years that he has served as a coordinator, including first in 2019, fifth in both 2020 and 2021 and second in 2023. Since he entered the NFL coaching ranks in 2009, seven special teams players have been named to eight Pro Bowls under his tutelage. Rizzi has also coached six players to the NFL All-Rookie team in the past ten years.

Over his Saints coaching career, Rizzi's work on special teams have made the kicking game an integral part of New Orleans' success since 2019. Over that period, J.T. Gray's 81 tackles over that period rank first in the NFL. The punting game has produced the top three seasons in club history for punts inside-the-20-yard line. Since 2019, the Saints have excelled in the return game. Over the five-and-a-half season period, the team ranks seventh in the NFL in punt return average [10.3] and second in punt return touchdowns [3]. The coverage units have allowed the third-lowest punt return average [7.1].

Last season, New Orleans finished in the Top 10 in the NFL in 13-of-22 special teams categories, leading or sharing the lead in five of them and finishing second in two others.

A native of Hillsdale, N.J. and graduate of Bergen Catholic High School, Rizzi played tight end at Rhode Island, where he first walked on in 1988. He went on to tally 160 receptions for 2,426 yards [15.2 avg.] and 15 touchdowns in his collegiate career and was a consensus All-American in 1992, earning a degree in speech communications.

Rizzi and his wife, Tracey, have two daughters and three sons.



Named the 23rd full-time head coach in franchise history on Jan. 12, 2017, Sean McVay became the youngest head coach in modern NFL history.

During the 2023 season, the Rams finished 10-7 and clinched a Wild Card berth against the Lions after going 7-1 in their final eight games. The Rams finished 5-12 in 2022 after an injury-riddled team forced young players to step up. The stars aligned in 2021 as McVay and the Rams went "all in" to win Super Bowl LVI. He finished the regular season 12-5 and became the youngest head coach in NFL history to win a Super Bowl.

In 2020, McVay and the Rams posted a 10-6 record, McVay's fourth-consecutive winning season, and earned his third playoff berth in his first four seasons. During the 2019 season the Rams posted a 9-7 record, the third straight winning season under McVay. In 2018, his second season as head coach, the Rams won 13 games, tied for the second-most single-season wins in franchise history, and competed in the organization's first Super Bowl. In his first season in 2017, the Rams won seven more games than the previous season, went from last in the league in scoring to first, and made their first postseason appearance in 13 years.

Prior to joining the Rams, McVay was the offensive coordinator [2014-16], tight ends coach [2011-13] and offensive assistant [2010] in Washington. McVay joined Washington prior to 2010 after an undefeated regular season with the Florida Tuskers of the United Football League. The Tuskers finished a perfect 6-0 before losing in the UF's inaugural championship game. McVay originally entered the National Football League as an offensive assistant with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

The Atlanta, Ga. native played wide receiver at Miami [Ohio]. His grandfather, John McVay, served in various administrative roles, including director of research development for the New York Giants [1976] and vice president/director of football operations for the San Francisco 49ers [1983-94], as well as serving one year as general manager in San Francisco [1998-99]. John McVay oversaw five Super Bowl championship squads and earned induction into the 49ers Hall of Fame in 2013.

## SERIES HISTORY

The Saints and Rams have played 77 times in the regular season with Los Angeles holding a 43-34 edge, while the clubs have split two playoff contests. Former longtime foes in the NFC West, the Saints have played only the Atlanta Falcons [112] more often [regular season/postseason combined]. In the 77 regular season meetings of the series between the Saints and Rams there has been:

- 1,610 points scored by New Orleans, 1,762 allowed to the Rams.
- A seven-game New Orleans winning streak from 1990-93.

- Two three-game New Orleans winning streaks in contests played at the Superdome from 1985-87 and 1990-92.
- 41 games decided by double-digits.
- Ten games decided by 21 or more points.
- 35 games decided by eight points or less.
- One 31-point win by New Orleans.
- A 31-point loss by New Orleans.

## LAST MEETING

### Rams 30, Saints 22; Dec. 21, 2023 @ SoFi Stadium

- The Black and Gold dropped a 30-22 decision to the Los Angeles Rams on Thursday Night Football in a valiant effort where they fought back from a 30-7 fourth quarter deficit to be within eight points compliments of big plays on offense, defense and special teams.

Despite falling behind early in a contest where they were missing four offensive and defensive starters, New Orleans rebounded from the 30-7 deficit to come within eight points with 3:55 remaining in the contest. Saints QB Derek Carr engineered a 12-play, 75-yard drive midway through the game's final period that ended with a five-yard touchdown pass to TE Juwan Johnson. When the Rams got the ball back, the New Orleans defense got them off the field and DB J.T. Gray forced an eight-yard punt. After getting the ball back, on the second play of the drive, Carr connected with rookie WR A.T. Perry on a 35-yard touchdown throw. Second-year WR Chris Olave combined with Perry and Johnson for offensive fireworks with nine receptions for 123 yards. Defensively, DE Carl Granderson extended his career-high and team-high sack total to 8.5 with one take-down.

**Sept. 8, 2024 @ Caesars Superdome** - The New Orleans Saints, behind three **Derek Carr** touchdown passes, the power of two rushing touchdowns and four **Blake Grupe** field goals, defeated the visiting Carolina Panthers in a convincing 47-10 performance, at the Caesars Superdome. New Orleans dominated Carolina in all three phases of the contest.

The Saints jumped out to a 30-0 lead, scored on their first nine possessions [tying a club record for scores on consecutive possessions] and held the football for 36:39 in time of possession en route to the highest scoring total and most lopsided opening day victory in team history. New Orleans won their sixth consecutive season opener, a club record and the current longest opener winning streak in the National Football League

The New Orleans defense also displayed their mettle, allowing only 193 total net yards of offense by the Panthers and held Carolina to just one of ten third downs.

The Saints defense recorded three takeaways and CB **Alontae Taylor** became the first Saints defensive back to record three sacks in a contest, but fans were excited by the debut of a new-look offense that helped the Saints control the clock with a rushing game that gained 180 yards and two touchdowns largely behind **Alvin Kamara's** 83 yards. Carr completed 19-of-23 passes [82.6 pct.] for 200 yards with three touchdown passes, zero interceptions and a 142.5 passer rating. The New Orleans defense harassed Carolina QB **Bryce Young** all day, as he completed only 13-of-30 passes for 161 yards with two interceptions and a 32.8 passer rating.

- With the victory, the Saints improved to 23-35 in season openers and extend their club-record winning streak of season openers to six straight, currently the longest streak in the NFL.
- WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed** led New Orleans with 73 receiving yards on three receptions [24.3 avg.] with one touchdown reception from 59 yards out, the longest play of the game. Including 60 punt return yards, sparked by a 47-yard runback and a 33-yard kickoff return, Shaheed finished with 163 all-purpose yards.

**WEEK 2: New Orleans Saints 44, Dallas Cowboys 19; Sept. 15, 2024 @ AT&T Stadium** - The Saints posted an impressive road victory at Dallas behind the powerful offensive firepower of RB **Alvin Kamara**, the arm of QB **Derek Carr**, the hands of WRs **Chris Olave** and **Rashid Shaheed** and two interceptions by the defense.

The Saints struck first on the opening drive as Carr led the offense down the field on a sequence end in the fourth quarter, Carr was intercepted on a tipped pass, but on the next play, New Orleans got the ball back on an interception by S **Tyrann Mathieu**, his second takeaway of the season. On the ensuing drive, New Orleans closed out the scoring in the contest with a 26-yard field goal by K **Blake Grupe**. Carr completed 11-of-16 passes for 243 yards with two touchdown throws and one interception, while scoring one rushing touchdown for a 125.0 passer rating. Kamara led the club in rushing with a game-high 115 yards on 20 carries with three touchdowns to go with two receptions for 65 yards, including a career-long 57-yard scoring grab on a screen pass. Shaheed led the Saints in receiving with four grabs for 96 yards with the deep touchdown, reaching the end zone in his third consecutive contest dating back to 2023.

The Saints defense harassed Prescott, sacking him three times and forcing two interceptions. CB **Alontae Taylor** led the team with a career-high nine tackles, while CB **Paulson Adebbo** had his first interception of the season and DE **Carl Granderson** picked up 1.5 sacks.

- The win marked the first time the Saints have won in Dallas since a 34-31 overtime victory on December 23, 2012.

- A stingy Saints run defense held the Cowboys to 68 yards rushing on 21 carries [3.2 avg.].
- The 91 points by New Orleans in their first two games are tied for the second-most in NFL history through the first two games of a season, behind the Saints' 93 point total in 2009.



**WEEK 3: Philadelphia Eagles 15, New Orleans Saints 12; Sept. 22, 2024 @ Caesars Superdome** - Philadelphia S **Reed Blankenship** intercepted Saints QB **Derek Carr** with 48 seconds left to preserve a 15-12 win over New Orleans in the Caesars Superdome.

The Saints had overcome an unsuccessful fourth-and-one conversion attempts and a 65-yard touchdown run by Eagles RB **Saquon Barkley** to take the lead in the fourth quarter with just over two minutes left, 12-7, with a field goal and a 13-yard touchdown connection from Carr and WR **Chris Olave**.

However, upon the Eagles getting the ball back, Philadelphia QB **Jalen Hurts** completed a pass to TE **Dallas Goedert** for a 61-yard gain and Barkley punched in a touchdown from four yards in. The Eagles improved to 2-1, while the Saints fell to 2-1.

Carr completed 14-of-25 passes for 142 yards with one touchdown and one interception. Olave had six receptions for 86 yards, including a 13-yard touchdown catch. RB **Alvin Kamara** rushed for 87 yards and caught three passes for 40 yards from 127 total yards from scrimmage.

DE **Carl Granderson** had 1.5 sacks and a forced fumble and DT **Bryan Bresee** tied a career-high with two takedowns. S **Tyrann Mathieu** had an interception, giving him takeaways in four straight games for the first time in his career dating back to the 2023 season finale. CB **Paulson Adebbo** led the team with a career-high ten solo tackles and one pass breakup.

### EAGLES VS. SAINTS (CONT.)

- The loss snapped a four-game winning streak, and a four-game home win streak.
- For the third consecutive game, the Saints scored on their first offensive possession with the Grupe field goal. It marked the first time since Weeks 17 and 18 of the 2022 season and the 2023 season opener, that the Saints scored on their opening possession in three consecutive games.
- Mathieu's interception was the 35th of his career since coming into the league in 2013. He and Minnesota's Harrison Smith are tied as the NFL's interception leaders among active players.
- Dating back to Week 17 of the 2023 season, New Orleans has won the takeaway battle in five consecutive contests.

### WEEK 4: Atlanta Falcons 26, New Orleans Saints 24; September 29, 2024 @ Mercedes-Benz Stadium

- Despite several significant injuries going into the contest and in-game, the Saints took the Falcons to the limit before dropping a 26-24 heartbreaker at Mercedes-Benz Stadium.

Atlanta K **Younghoe Koo's** 58-yard field goal with two seconds left was the difference. New Orleans rebounded from a fumbled punt return for a touchdown early in the first quarter to reach the end zone on rushing touchdowns by TE **Taysom Hill** on their first two offensive possessions, his first two scores of the season, before departing with an abdomen injury.

Atlanta took the lead back in the second quarter at 17-14 on a 53-yard Koo field goal and a 44-yard **Troy Andersen** interception return for a touchdown. Koo added to the scoring with a 44-yard field goal midway through the third quarter and then **Blake Grupe** and Koo traded field goals with the Falcons taking the end for the majority of the third and fourth quarters until QB **Derek Carr** engineered a nine-play, 42-yard drive ending with a one-yard touchdown run by RB **Alvin Kamara** with one minute left to pull ahead, 24-23. But Atlanta rallied, as the Falcons gained 30 yards on a pass interference penalty to set up Koo's 58-yard kick.

**WEEK 5: Kansas City Chiefs 26, New Orleans Saints 13; October 7, 2024 @ GEHA Field at Arrowhead Stadium** - Despite missing five starters due to various injuries, the Saints put forth a valiant effort in a 26-13 loss to the defending Super Bowl champion Kansas City Chiefs on Monday Night Football, closing to within three points early in the fourth quarter before the Chiefs had a late ten-point scoring outburst. After falling behind 10-0 in the contest, New Orleans moved to within three points midway through the second quarter when QB **Derek Carr** found WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed** for a 43-yard touchdown pass to cap a seven-play, 74-yard drive.

But after Kansas City milked the clock for a 15-play, 44-yard drive that ended with a 34-yard field goal by K **Harrison Butker**, the Chiefs forced a quick three-and-out and drove down the field for a 28-yard field goal. The two successful kicks late in the second quarter gave the Chiefs a 13-7 halftime lead.

New Orleans would rally with a 37-yard interception return by DT **Khalen Saunders** that set up a six-yard touchdown connection between Carr and TE **Foster Moreau**, but the Chiefs then ran down the field in five-plays and 68 yards, extending their lead to ten on a three-yard rushing touchdown by rookie WR **Xavier Worthy**.

### WEEK 6: Tampa Bay Buccaneers 51, Saints 27; October 13, 2024 @ Caesars Superdome

- With the Buccaneers evacuated to New Orleans for their practice week due to Hurricane Milton, the Saints got caught in a storm of emotion and offensive production by Tampa Bay in a loss that dropped them to 2-4. Tampa Bay, who scored 24 unanswered points in the second half after trailing 27-24 at halftime, had 595 total yards of offense.

In the contest, QB **Spencer Rattler** made his first career NFL start in place of an injured **Derek Carr** (oblique). Rattler completed 22-of-40 passes for 243 yards with a ten-yard touchdown pass to fellow rookie wide receiver **Bub Means** and two interceptions. Rattler also utilized his feet with four carries for 27 yards.

Buccaneers QB **Baker Mayfield** overcame three second quarter interceptions to complete 24-of-36 passes for 325 yards with four touchdown passes. He was aided by a ground game that added 277 yards and two touchdowns.

Mayfield and the Buccaneers jumped out to a 17-0 first quarter lead, but New Orleans would rally. Special teams provided a spark to put the team back into it. WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed** returned a punt 54 yards for a touchdown early in the second quarter to put the Saints within seven. On Tampa Bay's next possession, CB **Paulson Adebo** intercepted Mafield and K **Blake Grupe** drilled a 29-yard field goal.

Two plays after the field goal, S **Johnathan Abram** intercepted a tipped pass and returned it 30 yards to the Tampa Bay ten-yard line. Rattler then connected with fellow rookie WR **Bub Means** for a ten-yard touchdown to put New Orleans ahead 20-17. After Tampa Bay took the lead quickly on a Mayfield touchdown pass, the Saints responded with a seven-play, 70-yard drive that ended with a four-yard rushing touchdown by RB **Alvin Kamara** to give the Saints would would be a 27-24 halftime lead.

The two clubs traded punts on the first two possessions of the third quarter, but on New Orleans' second possession of the quarter, Tampa Bay turned up the heat on Rattler with two straight sacks on first and second down, forcing a punt. On Tampa Bay's next drive, Mayfield connected with WR **Chris Godwin** on a 55-yard touchdown to give the Buccaneers the lead for good on the afternoon.

**WEEK 7: Denver Broncos 33, Saints 10; October 17, 2024 @ Caesars Superdome** - Difficulties on third down and a standout performance on the ground by the Broncos offense combined to give the Saints their fifth consecutive loss.

The Broncos and Saints traded punts on their first possessions. Denver scored when they got the ball back for their second possession on a 46-yard **Wil Lutz** field goal. Broncos LB **Cody Barton** then sacked Saints QB **Spencer Rattler** and forced him to fumble with the recovery by LB **Kwon Alexander**. at the Denver 45-yard line, setting up a 32-yard Lutz kick. The Saints were forced to punt on their first possession of the second quarter and Broncos QB **Bo Nix** engineered an eight-play, 86-yard drive that ended with an eight-yard touchdown run by RB **Javonte Williams** to give Denver a 13-0 lead.

Nix matched a Saints field goal on his and Denver's next possession, successfully running a two-minute drill that gave the Broncos a 16-3 halftime lead following a 52-yard Lutz field goal.

Denver broke open the contest in the third quarter, where they forced three New Orleans punts and added on a 38-yard field goal by Lutz and a five-yard rushing touchdown by Williams to take a 26-3 edge going into the final period.

The Broncos scored their final points of the evening with just over four minutes remaining in the fourth quarter when CB **Ja'Quan McMillian** sacked Rattler and forced him to fumble, with the ball recovered by Barton and returned 52 yards for a touchdown. With QB **Jake Haener** entering the contest to allow Rattler to rest a hip pointer injury, New Orleans would achieve some offensive thrythm to end the contest when Haener engineered a 11-play, 79-yard drive that ended with a 12-yard touchdown pass to WR **Cedrick Wilson Jr.**, the second-year signal-caller's first career touchdown pass and the sixth-year wideout's first scoring grab as a Saint.



**WEEK 8: Los Angeles Chargers 26, Saints 8; October 27, 2024 @ SoFi Stadium** - Los Angeles QB **Justin Herbert** threw two touchdowns and had a career-long 38-yard rush, while RB **J.K Dobbins** rushed for 57 yards and pounded in a score to erase an early 2-0 deficit in the Saints' return to Southern California, where they held the first portion of their training camp.

## SAINTS AT L.A. CHARGERS (CONT.)

The early lead for New Orleans came on an abated punt play, where LS **Josh Harris** fumbled the ball and when it was picked up by P **JK Scott**, TE **Taysom Hill** tackled him and forced him to fumble with the ball going out of the end zone for a safety. Late in the first quarter, Herbert carried for a 38-yard gain on a drive and the early Saints lead was erased by a 46-yard **Cameron Dicker** field goal on the first play of the second quarter. In the second quarter, Los Angeles embarked on a 15-play, 90-yard drive that ended with a one-yard rushing touchdown by **Dobbins**, which following a missed extra point, extended the lead to 9-2. New Orleans got the ball back with 1:37 left in the first half at their 30 and drove to cut the deficit to 9-5 on a 40-yard field goal by **Blake Grupe**.

The Chargers took a 16-5 lead on a 60-yard touchdown connection from Herbert to WR **Ladd McConkey**. New Orleans got the ball back and took advantage of a Chargers unnecessary roughness penalty, followed two plays later by a 14-yard completion from QB **Spencer Rattler** to WR **Chris Olave** to the Los Angeles 38-yard line. However, a holding penalty assessed to T **Trevor Penning** knocked New Orleans out of field goal range. The Saints forced a three and out, powered by a sack by DT **Khalen Saunders** and QB **Jake Haener** entered the contest in place of Rattler. Haener, then led New Orleans on eight-play drive that ended with a 43-yard field goal to put the Saints within eight.

On the next drive that led into the fourth quarter, Herbert connected with WR **Joshua Palmer** for a 45-yard gain, that set up a 29-yard field goal. The clubs then traded punts on their next two possessions, with the Saints eventually reaching Chargers territory on a drive powered by a 28-yard connection from Haener to Olave. However New Orleans was set back by a failed 44-yard field goal attempt by Grupe. On the following possession, the Chargers drove 66 yards in nine plays and McConkey hauled in a nine-yard touchdown pass from Herbert for a 26-8 lead with 3:22 remaining.

Rattler was 12-of-24 passing for 156 yards and Haener completed nine-of-17 throws for 122 yards. Olave, caught eight passes for 107 yards in the team's first 100-yard receiving performance of the season and the ninth of his career.

Los Angeles out-gained New Orleans, 378-366. The Saints were 2-for-16 on third down conversions, while the Chargers were only 3-of-12 on third down attempts.



**WEEK 9: Carolina Panthers 23, New Orleans Saints 22; November 3, 2024 @ Bank of America Stadium** - An inspired effort on offense by RB **Alvin Kamara** was spoiled by Carolina RB **Chuba Hubbard's** game-winning 16-yard rushing touchdown with 2:18 remaining. The Saints were unable to drive within field goal range on their final possession. After two first quarter Saints field goals, the Panthers had staked a 7-6 lead midway through the second quarter with a three-yard touchdown connection from QB **Bryce Young** to rookie WR **Xavier Legette**.

New Orleans took the lead back on a seven-yard touchdown run by TE **Taysom Hill**, but Carolina moved back to within three with a 48-yard kick by K **Eddie Pineiro** with 38 seconds left in the first half. Coming out of halftime, the Panthers chewed up 5:05 off the clock on a nine-play, 86-yard drive that ended with a one-yard rushing touchdown by Hubbard. New Orleans answered and moved to within one point on a 51-yard field goal by **Blake Grupe** and then the defense forcing a three-and-out.

In a drive that ran into the fourth quarter, New Orleans capitalized on the three-and out with starting field position at the 30-yard line and with Kamara accounting for 40 yards from scrimmage on the drive, QB **Derek Carr** found TE **Foster Moreau** for a 17-yard touchdown.

The clubs traded jabs for the rest of the game, starting with an acrobatic interception by Saints CB **Shemar Jean-Charles** making his first career pick in his first game started.

## SAINTS AT CAROLINA (CONT.)

On the ensuing drive, New Orleans was plagued by two holding penalties that set them back at their 18-yard line. The Saints got back to their 46-yard line, but were forced to punt. New Orleans again forced a three-and-out, but a face mask penalty assessed to T **Trevor Penning** on their first play from scrimmage on the drive set them back at their 13-yard line and eventually forced a punt.

After two deep pass attempts by Young that went incomplete, the second-year passer connected with Legette for a 26-yard gain on third-and-ten to the New Orleans 38-yard line. On the next play, Saints LB **Demario Davis** was assessed a 22-yard pass interference penalty, setting up the 16-yard go-ahead run by Hubbard. On the two-point attempt, Young was sacked by Saints DE **Chase Young**.

Starting at their 20-yard line, New Orleans got off to a promising start by collecting 20 yards between a four-yard carry by Kamara and a 16-yard completion from Carr to TE **Juwan Johnson**. But a sack for a six-yard loss by Panthers DT **Charles Harris** set New Orleans back to third-and-16. However after Kamara gained back 12 yards on a screen, WR **Cedrick Wilson** was unable to grasp a pass intended for him near the sideline and the Panthers would prevail for their second victory of the season.



- Kamara tied his career-high with 155 yards rushing, 12 yards short of the franchise career rushing yardage record. It was his tenth-career 100-yard rushing performance. He had a career-best 215 total yards from scrimmage, the highest total in the NFL this season and the fifth-highest single-game total in Saints history.
- Hill's seven-yard rushing touchdown was the 41st total score of his career, putting him a tie for ninth place in club record books with RB Pierre Thomas.

**WEEK 10: Saints 20, Atlanta Falcons 17; November 10, 2024 @ Caesars Superdome** - New Orleans broke a seven-game losing streak, holding on to defeat their division rivals as **Darren Rizzi** was successful in his debut as interim head coach.

New Orleans was led by an efficient and explosive performance through the air from **Derek Carr**, who completed 16-of-25 passes (64.0 pct.) for 269 yards with two touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 126.9 passer rating. Carr and WR **Marquez Valdes-Scantling** connected on two touchdowns.

Seeing his first significant action for the Black and Gold, Valdes-Scantling caught three passes for 109 yards (36.3 avg.). RB **Alvin Kamara** finished with 109 yards from scrimmage as he became the franchise's all-time rushing leader.

The New Orleans defense held the Falcons scoreless on four drives in the fourth quarter to allow Saints to maintain their lead. Three crucial fourth quarter splash plays took place. DE **Cameron Jordan** dropped QB **Kirk Cousins** to force a field goal attempt that was missed, S **Tyrann Mathieu** picked off Cousins in Saints territory and DE **Chase Young** dumped the signal-caller for a significant loss on a sack/forced fumble to preserve the victory.

Special teams also played an important role in the victory. DT **John Rideway III** blocked a 35-yard field goal attempt near the end of the second quarter, K **Blake Grupe** drilled both of his field goal attempts and P **Matthew Hayball** dropped four punts inside-the 20-yard line.



**WEEK 11: Saints 35, Cleveland Browns 14; November 17, 2024 @ Caesars Superdome** - New Orleans won their second straight game after snapping a seven-contest losing streak the week before.

## CLEVELAND VS. NEW ORLEANS (CONT.)

TE **Taysom Hill** enjoyed a standout performance as the Saints rushed for a season-high 214 yards. Hill captured NFC Offensive Player of the Week honors as he rushed seven times for a career-high 138 yards (career-high 19.7 avg.) and tied his career-high with three rushing touchdowns. Hill also had a significant impact in the passing game, as he caught a career-high eight passes for 50 yards and completed a pass for an 18-yard gain. On special teams, he returned a kickoff for 42 yards.

QB **Derek Carr** continued to be a model of efficiency since his return to health from an oblique injury, when he completed 21-of-27 passes (77.8 pct.) for 248 yards with touchdown passes to TE **Juwan Johnson** and WR **Marquez Valdes-Scantling** and a 129.6 passer rating. Valdes-Scantling continued his success in stretching the field since his Week Eight acquisition and expansion of his role, catching two passes for 87 yards, including a 71-yard scoring grab, aided by a key block by Johnson. Johnson finished with three receptions for 30 yards, including the fourth quarter, one-yard scoring grab. RB **Alvin Kamara** finished with 89 total yards from scrimmage.

The New Orleans defense held an opponent to under 20 points for the second consecutive week,



led by a front seven that provided three sacks on the pass rush and held the Browns to only 66 yards rushing on 20 carries (3.6 avg.).

LB **Demario Davis** finished with a season-high 13 tackles and two passes defended. DE **Carl Granderson** finished with four tackles, including two stops for loss and one sack. DT **Bryan Bresee** finished with 1.5 quarterback takedowns to increase his team-leading total to a career-high 5.5.

Special teams, the forte of Interim Head Coach **Darren Rizzi**, also held their own. WR **Dante Pettis** took over punt return duties and had a career-long to 53-yard return. All three of P **Matthew Hayball's** punts dropped inside-the-20-yard line. Second-year LB **Anfernee Orji** finished with two coverage tackles.

## HONORS

**WEEK 2: NFC Offensive Player of the Week, FedEx Ground Player of the Week and LFG (Tom Brady-FOX) Player of the Game Award - RB Alvin Kamara**

Made a significant impact in the running game and passing game in New Orleans' 44-19 win at the Dallas Cowboys. Kamara carried 20 times for 115 yards (5.8 avg.) with three touchdowns and caught two passes for 65 yards, including a career-long 57-yard touchdown.

**WEEK 9: NFL Way To Play Award - DB Shemar-Jean Charles**

Jean-Charles was honored for his first career interception, which he hauled in with 9:22 left to go in the fourth quarter of the Saints' game against the Carolina Panthers, ripping the ball right out of Panthers wide receiver Xavier Legette's hands. The Saints cornerback will receive a \$5,000 USA Football Equipment Grant from NFL Foundation for the youth or high school football program of his choice.

**WEEK 11: NFC Offensive Player of the Week, FedEx Ground Player of the Week - TE Taysom Hill**

Spearheaded a standout Saints offensive effort in a 35-14 victory over the Cleveland Browns on Sunday, where he carried seven times for career-high 138 yards (team record 19.7 avg.) with a career-high-tying three touchdowns, including a career-long 75-yard rush that ended in the end zone late in the fourth quarter. Hill also caught a career-high and club-best eight passes for 50 yards, completed a pass for a 18-yard gain and returned a kickoff 42 yards to finish with 188 total scrimmage yards and 230 all-purpose yards, both career-highs.

**TEAM NOTES**

**EVANS INDUCTED INTO SAINTS RING OF HONOR ON NOVEMBER 17 AND FORMER STANDOUT SELECTED AS SEMIFINALIST FOR PRO FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME'S CLASS OF 2025.**

Former New Orleans Saints guard Jahri Evans was inducted into the club's Ring of Honor during a half-time ceremony of the November 17 win over the Cleveland Browns.

Evans, 6-4, 318, was originally a fourth round draft pick (108th overall) of the Saints in 2006 out of Bloomsburg and developed into an anchor for one of the most dominant offenses in NFL history during his tenure with the Saints. The Philadelphia, Pa. native started all 169 regular season games he played in at right guard and all of the team's ten post-season contests during that period, including all three during the 2009 campaign when the Saints captured Super Bowl XLIV.

**TEAM NOTES**

A five-time Associated Press All-Pro (2009-13), Evans was selected first-team four times, twice as much as any other Saint. Evans was selected to six straight Pro Bowls (2009-14) and was named to the Pro Football Hall of Fame's 2010's All-Decade Team. During his 11-year tenure, the Saints were ranked first in the NFL in total offense (net yards per game) six times (2006, 2008-09, 2011, 2014 and 2016) and in scoring (points per game) twice (2008-09). The 274 sacks surrendered by the Saints offensive line from 2006-16 were the lowest total in the NFL over the period and the unit was recognized twice (2009 and 2011) as the winner of the Madden Pro-protector Offensive Line Award.

Evans closed out his playing career starting 14 games at right guard for the Green Bay Packers in 2017, finishing with 183 total games played/started. A Pro Football Hall of Fame semifinalist in 2023, finalist in 2024 and has reached the semifinalist round for the Class of 2025 process, Evans began his coaching career as an offensive assistant for the Saints in 2023.

Gary Kubiak was head coach of the Houston Texans from 2006-13 and the Denver Broncos from 2015-16, including the Super Bowl 50 champions. Brother Klay, serves as the 49ers passing game specialist. Brother Klein works in the Dallas Cowboys player personnel department.

**Senior Vice President/Asst. General Manager-College Personnel Jeff Ireland** - Stepson of Chiefs Hall of Fame linebacker/center E.J. Holub. Grandson of Philadelphia Eagles running back and Chicago Bears personnel executive Jim Parmer.

**National Scout Terry Wooden** - Brother, Jojo is Senior Director of Player Personnel for the Las Vegas Raiders.

**Quarterback Derek Carr** - Older brother, David was the No. 1 overall pick in the 2002 NFL Draft by the Houston Texans and played quarterback in the league for 11 seasons with Houston, Carolina, the New York Giants and San Francisco. Uncle, Lon Boyett, played tight end for Tampa Bay, the Raiders and San Francisco.

**Linebacker Demario Davis** - Cousin of the late Steve McNair, the standout quarterback for the Tennessee Titans (1995-2005) and Baltimore Ravens (2006-07).

**Tight End Taysom Hill** - Brother-in-law, David Nixon, played linebacker and on special teams for the Oakland Raiders (2009), Houston Texans (2010) and St. Louis Rams (2010-11).

**Tight End Juwan Johnson** - Brother, George, played defensive end for eight years in the NFL with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, Minnesota Vikings, Detroit Lions and Saints.

**Defensive End Cameron Jordan** - Father, Steve, had a prolific 13-year career at tight end for the Minnesota Vikings, with six Pro Bowl selections, being inducted into their Ring of Honor.

**Center/guard Erik McCoy** - Cousin of former Dolphins and Buccaneers running back Jorvorski Lane.

**Linebacker Nephi Sewell** - One brother Penei, is a member of the Detroit Lions after getting selected seventh overall in the 2021 NFL Draft. Another brother, Noah, was selected by the Chicago Bears in the fifth round of the 2023 NFL Draft.

**Practice Squad wide receiver Equanimeous St. Brown** - Younger brother, Amon-Ra, plays wide receiver for the Lions.

**Area Scout Matt Phillips** - Father, Ted, worked in the Chicago Bears front office from 1983-2022, including serving his last 24 years as team president.

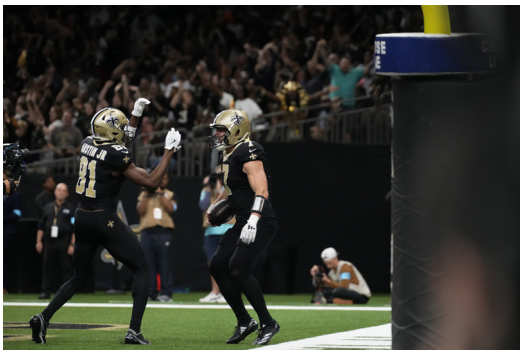

### BUCKING THE ODDS

The Saints have a long tradition of finding players as free agents signed after the draft that make an impact immediately or after developing their careers initially on the practice squad. Several undrafted Saints on the roster play key roles on offense, defense and special teams, including five undrafted rookies who are on the 53-man roster.

Over the past 21 years, the Saints [2018-22: DB **J.T. Gray**, WR/RS **Deonte Harty** and WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed**] and San Diego/Los Angeles Chargers [2003: G **Kris Dielman**, TE **Antonio Gates** and WR **Kasim Osgood**] are the only two teams to have three players signed as undrafted free agents be selected to a Pro Bowl for the team that originally signed them.

Originally signed as an undrafted free agent in 2018, spending part of his rookie season on the practice squad, Gray's 83 special teams tackles since 2019 rank first in the NFL, as he has been selected as both an AP first-team All-Pro and Pro Bowler. In 2023, the special teams captain finished the season with 11 coverage stops to lead the team and tie for 12th in the league, despite missing three contests with injuries. In 2024, he is ranked first on the team with 18 stops and had a blocked punt on Sept. 22 vs. Philadelphia, adding three tackles and one forced fumble.

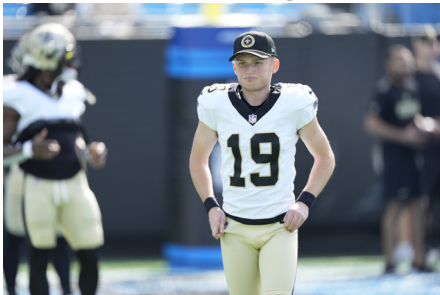
DE **Carl Granderson** joined the club in 2019 as an undrafted free agent out of Wyoming and has appeared in 82 regular season games with 35 starts, posting 217 tackles [127 solo], 27.5 sacks for a loss of 180 yards, four passes defensed, four forced fumbles and two recoveries. In 2023, Granderson earned the starting right end position and posted a career-high 78 tackles [44 solo], led the team with a career-best 8.5 sacks for a loss of 55 yards, defensed one pass and forced a fumble and recovered one.

## RAMS VS. SAINTS

Granderson's 78 stops ranked fifth in the National Football League among defensive linemen and were the most by a Saints lineman since 2004. He has opened all 11 games in 2024 and has recorded 38 tackles (24 solo), 4.5 sacks, seven stops for loss, two passes defended and one forced fumble to lead the defensive line in stops.



Joining New Orleans following the 2023 NFL Draft, after a graduate transfer season at Notre Dame and playing most of his college career at Arkansas State, **K Blake Grupe** won a preseason competition to handle placekicking duties and in two seasons, has drilled 48-of-56 field goal attempts (85.7 pct.), including 18-of-19 kicks (94.7 pct.) in 2024 with a career-long of 57 yards in the season-opening win over Carolina. Dating back to the Dec. 17, 2023 win over the New York Giants until a fourth quarter miss on Oct. 27 at the Los Angeles Chargers, Grupe had made 19 consecutive field goals, the longest streak of his career and tied for sixth-longest in franchise history. He has made 14 straight in home contests.



New Orleans signed P **Matthew Hayball** out of Vanderbilt following the NFL Draft. The West Adelaide, Australia native finished as Vandy's all-time leader in punting average (46.5) and was a consensus second-team All-American in 2023, when he ranked seventh nationally in net (43.1). Hayball won a training camp competition to secure the job. In ten games, he has punted 47 times with a 40.5 net punting average, with his 27 inside the 20-yard line ranked second in the NFL.

Signing with New Orleans following the 2024 NFL Draft, **S Millard Bradford** was a five-year letterman and two-time Honorable Mention All-Big 12 selection at TCU, finishing his Horned Frog career with 231 stops (175 solo), 16.5 tackles for loss, one sack for a nine-yard loss, four interceptions, 21 passes defended, two forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. After starting the season on the practice squad, the Helotes, Texas native was signed to the active roster on Nov. 2 and has played in the last two games on special teams.

TE **Dallin Holker** was signed by New Orleans after a standout graduate transfer campaign at Colorado State, where he posted 64 receptions for 767 yards with six touchdowns, the highest total of yardage and scoring grabs in the college regular season by an FBS tight end. Holker's performance in the off-season and training camp secured a roster spot behind Johnson, Taysom Hill and Foster Moreau. Holker has played in six games with one start and has recorded one coverage tackle.

TE **Juwan Johnson** first led Saints tight ends with four touchdown receptions in 2021, converting to the position that offseason after playing wideout in college and as a rookie in 2020, signed as an undrafted free agent from Oregon. In 2022, he led the Black and Gold tight ends in receiving with 42 grabs for 508 yards with a club-best and career-high seven touchdowns, tied for third at the position in the NFL. Johnson led the team's tight ends with 37 grabs for 368 yards with four touchdown grabs in 2023. Johnson has led the Saints with 13 receiving touchdowns over the past three seasons, tied for fifth over that period among league NFL tight ends.

In 2024, Johnson quickly recovered from foot surgery in June and has played in all 11 games, recording 25 receptions for 277 yards with two touchdowns. Johnson has combined with Taysom Hill and Foster Moreau to form an effective tight end trio.

After originally signing as an undrafted free agent out of Vanderbilt in 2023, where he led the Commodores in tackles in each of his final three seasons, LB **Anfernee Orji** received the opportunity to see extensive snaps in the preseason due to injuries to teammates Demario Davis and Pete Werner. He ranks second on the team with 14 coverage stops and has also added 15 defensive tackles. [nine solo].

CB **Rico Payton** signed a college free agent contract in April, playing his final four years at Pittsburg State. In 2023, the St. Louis native recorded 35 tackles with four interceptions and 15 passes defensed. Payton secured a roster spot with his performance in the preseason, leading the team with five passes defensed and adding seven defensive tackles and one coverage stop in three contests. Payton has contributed on both defense and special teams in ten games with one pass breakup and eight coverage stops.

WR **Mason Tipton** stuck on the 53-man roster after showing bright spots in training camp practices, following a college career at Yale, where he posted 132 receptions for 1,067 yards with 19 TDs. In 2024, he has 14 receptions for 99 yards.

After originally signing with New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Utah in 2022, LB **Nephi Sewell** has become a valued member of the special teams units in his first two seasons, while also providing depth on defense. In his first full season in 2023 on the active roster, Sewell totaled five coverage stops and one forced fumble on special teams and ten defensive tackles. Sewell spent the first ten weeks Reserve/Physically Unable to Perform, recovering from a knee injury suffered in Week 17 of the 2023 campaign, but returned to action in the Week 11 victory over Cleveland.

Also the number of rookies on the 53-man roster, including five draft picks [T Taliese Fuaga, CB Kool-Aid McKinstry, DT Khristian Boyd, LB Jaylan Ford, and QB Spencer Rattler] and five free agents [P Matthew Hayball, S Millard Bradford, TE Dallin Holker, CB Rico Payton and WR Mason Tipton].

**60** - Club-record number of rushing touchdowns by Kamara, the second-highest league total since he was drafted by the Saints in 2017. The total is tied for 53rd all-time after he rushed for one score on Oct. 13, vs. Tampa Bay. With one rushing touchdown on Sunday vs. the Los Angeles Rams, he would move into a tie for 50th.

**75** - Kamara's 75 receptions in 2023 led NFC tailbacks and ranked second in the NFL at running back. With 75 catches in 2024, he would become the first running back in NFL history with at least 75 grabs in six career seasons. In 2024, Kamara's 55 receptions leads both his team in receiving and league running backs.

**85** - The franchise-record number of total touchdowns by Kamara, second-highest in the National Football League since 2017 and tied for 57th all-time. With one touchdown Sunday, Kamara would move into a tie for 53rd and with two, would move into a tie for 52nd.

Combined with his four touchdowns on Sept. 15 and a 172-yard, six-touchdown performance on Christmas day in 2020 vs. Minnesota, he became the fifth player in the Super Bowl era with multiple career games with at least 150 scrimmage yards and four touchdowns, joining Pro Football Hall of Famers LaDainian Tomlinson [four games], Marshall Faulk [three] and Jerry Rice [two], as well as Clinton Portis [two].

**255** - Number of career touchdown passes by Carr, tied with Pro Football Hall of Fame QB Sonny Jurgensen [Class of 1983] for 22nd in NFL record books. With one touchdown pass on Sunday, Carr will take sole possession of 22nd.

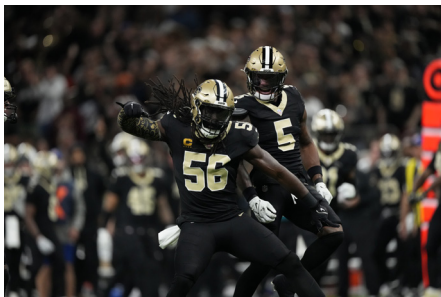

Competitiveness against opposing passing attacks has become a mantra of the defensive coaching staff. New Orleans’ 99 passes defended in 2023 were ranked first in the NFL with CB Paulson Adebo ranked third individually with a career-high 18 and two other players in the top ten, including cornerback Alontae Taylor (career-high 14), making the Saints the only team with three players in the top ten. In 2024, New Orleans is ranked third in the NFL with 62 with Taylor tied for third in the league individually with 12.

**SUPER SPECIAL TEAMS UNITS**

In their fifth year under the supervision of **Darren Rizzi**, who was elevated to interim head coach on Monday after supervising special teams since 2019, the Saints special teams units finished 2023 ranked second in the NFL under writer Rick Gosselin’s comprehensive rankings system. This was the fourth top five ranking by the Saints special teams units during Rizzi’s tenure, based on 22 kicking-game categories with New Orleans leading or sharing the lead in five of them and finishing in the top ten in 13.



**SPECIAL TEAMS TOUCHDOWNS**

In 2023, New Orleans recorded two touchdowns on special teams for the first time since the 2017 campaign. WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed** had a 76-yard punt return for a touchdown at Green Bay on Sept. 24, the team’s first punt return for a touchdown since 2019. On Dec. 10, vs. Carolina, LB **Nephi Sewell** force Panthers P Johnny Hekker to fumble on a punt play, which was recovered by LB **D’Marco Jackson** for an eight-yard touchdown. New Orleans scored their first of 2024 on October 13, when Shaheed returned a punt 54 yards for a score vs. Tampa Bay.

Pettis, a speedster, who was originally a second round pick of the San Francisco 49ers out of the University of Washington in 2018 and the son of former major league baseball base stealing legend, Gary Pettis, had a career-long 53-yard punt return in the second half of the team's 35-14 win over Cleveland on Nov. 17, to set up a touchdown. As a team, New Orleans is ranked fifth in the National Football League in team punt return average, one of five clubs to have a runback for a touchdown. With the 54-yard touchdown by Rashid and the 53-yard runback by Pettis, the Saints are the only team in the NFL in 2024 to have two punt returns of 50-or-more yards.

Signed by the Saints following the 2018 NFL Draft out of Mississippi State, Gray has been voted by his teammates as a special teams captain for the past three seasons and has been selected both as a Pro Bowl starter and *Associated Press* All-Pro. Playing in 92 career games, Gray has career totals of 86 special teams stops, two blocked punts, three fumble recoveries and 13 defensive tackles, 2.5 sacks, one forced fumble and a pass defense. In 2023, he finished with 11 coverage stops to lead the team and tie for 12th in the NFL in 14 contests. Gray's special teams impact was at its best on September 22 vs. Philadelphia, when he blocked a punt in the third quarter against the Eagles, the second of his career.

## QUARTERBACKS

### DEREK CARR



On March 6, 2023, the Saints agreed to terms with Derek Carr on a four-year contract to solidify the quarterback position. He spent the first nine seasons of his NFL career with the Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders. Originally selected in the second round [36th overall] of the 2014 NFL Draft by the Raiders out of Fresno State, the Bakersfield, Calif. native has started all 167 career regular season games he has played in, the most starts at the position over that time, completing 3,721-of-5,717 passes [65.1 pct.] for 40,842 yards with 255 touchdown passes, 111 interceptions and a 92.9 passer rating, while adding 932 rushing yards and seven touchdowns. Since entering the league in 2014, Carr ranks first in the NFL in completions, second in passing yardage and sixth in passing touchdowns. He became the third quarterback in NFL history to pass for 3,000-plus yards in each of his first ten seasons, joining Pro Football Hall of Fame signal-caller Peyton Manning and Russell Wilson. He is just the seventh player in NFL history to reach 40,000 passing yards in his first nine seasons and has completed 316 passes of 25+ yards since he entered the league in 2014, third-most in the NFL over that span.

Carr started all 17 games in 2023 and completed 375-of-548 passes [68.4 pct.] for 3,878 yards with 25 touchdowns, eight interceptions and a 97.7 passer rating. He finished his first season in Black and Gold ranked second in the NFL in fourth quarter passer rating [106.9], sixth in completion percentage, seventh in completions and tenth in TD passes and passer rating.

In 2024, Carr has completed 145-of-211 passes [68.7 pct.] for 1,742 yards, 15 touchdowns, only seven interceptions and a 106.4 passer rating. He missed his first games as a Saint in Weeks Six-Eight [oblique], but returned to action for the team's Week nine contest at Carolina and is ranked first in the NFL in third down passer rating [124.9] and fourth in the NFL in passer rating.

## RUNNING BACKS

### ALVIN KAMARA

A talented runner and receiver who was selected by the Saints in the third round of the 2017 NFL Draft out of Tennessee, Kamara enjoyed an outstanding rookie campaign. He ranked first on the club and sixth in the NFL in yards from scrimmage (1,554), second on the team in rushing and receiving, carrying 120 times for 728 yards (6.1 avg) with eight TDs and a two-point conversion, catching 81 passes for 826 yards (10.2 avg) with five touchdowns and one kickoff return for a touchdown. Kamara set a club rookie record with 14 total scores, tied for second in the NFL and finished first in the league in yards per carry. Kamara was the first Saints offensive rookie selected to the Pro Bowl since Rueben Mayes (1986), as an AP second team All-Pro (flex), the club's first rookie All-Pro since 1993. He was also named *The Sporting News* NFL Rookie of the Year and AP NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year.

In 112 career regular season games with 81 starts, Kamara has carried 1,498 times for 6,611 yards (4.4 avg.) with 60 touchdowns and has caught 560 passes for 4,662 yards (8.3 avg.) with 24 touchdowns. Kamara is the franchise's all-time leader in rushing yards, rushing touchdowns, total touchdowns (85), total yards from scrimmage (11,273) and all-purpose yardage (11,931).

Kamara is enjoying a spectacular season in 2024, carrying 183 times for 782 yards (4.3 avg.) with six touchdowns and catching a club-best 55 passes for 443 yards (8.1 avg.) with a career-long 57-yard touchdown. With the ability to move the chains in volume, he is ranked third in the National Football league in total yards from scrimmage (1,225), fourth in first downs (59) and leads running backs in receiving.

### JAMAAL WILLIAMS

This seven-year NFL veteran was signed by the New Orleans Saints as an unrestricted free agent in the 2023 offseason. In eight NFL seasons with Green Bay [2017-20], Detroit [2021-22] and New Orleans [2023-], Williams has played in 111 games with 44 starts, carrying 1,053 times for 4,082 yards with 32 touchdowns, also catching 182 passes for 1,282 yards with eight touchdowns for 5,353 total yards from scrimmage. Williams is part of a formidable rushing trio with Kamara and his former college teammate, Taysom Hill. In 2024, he has spelled Kamara at key times, rushing for 124 yards with one touchdown and catching four passes for 21 yards.

### JORDAN MIMS

A former standout at Fresno State, where he rushed for 3,285 yards and 37 TDs, Mims joined the Saints practice squad after going to 2023 training camp with Buffalo and contributed on special teams in two games for the Black and Gold in 2023. 6-0, 205, Mims will contribute in the run game and on special teams after earning a roster spot and had a coverage tackle, Sept. 22, vs. Philadelphia and has rushed for 42 yards and caught four passes for 42 yards.

## WIDE RECEIVERS

### MARQUEZ VALDES-SCANTLING

A fifth round pick of the Green Bay Packers in 2018 out of South Florida, Valdes Scantling is a seven-year NFL veteran, who has played in 101 career regular season games with 63 starts for the Packers [2018-21], Kansas City Chiefs [2022-23], Buffalo Bills [2024] and Saints [2024-present]. He has posted career totals of 194 receptions for 3,382 yards [17.4 avg.] with 19 touchdowns and with his 6-4, 206-pound frame has the ability to win contested catches and make big plays. Valdes-Scantling's 17.4 yards per catch average since coming into the NFL in 2018, ranks first in the league.

## DEEP THREAT

In his second appearance with New Orleans, since signing two weeks ago, Valdes-Scantling put on one of the most impressive receiving performances of the season on Nov. 10, vs. Atlanta, grabbing three passes for 109 yards [36.3 avg.] with touchdowns of 40 yards and two years, as well as a 67-yard grab. In yards per catch [min. three receptions], Scantling's 36.3 average was the fifth-highest single game performance in the NFL in 2024. he followed that up on Nov. 17, when he turned a screen pass from Derek Carr into a 71-yard touchdown, the longest pass by by the team in 2024

**CEDRICK WILSON JR.**

This seventh-year wideout was signed by New Orleans to a two-year contract at the start of free agency to compete for snaps on offense and to provide veteran leadership to the wideout room. In 77 regular season games with seven starts, he has recorded 112 receptions for 1,391 yards with 12 touchdowns. In 2023, the Memphis native posted 22 catches for 296 yards with three touchdowns, adding three grabs for 37 yards in the postseason. In nine contests in 2024, Wilson has grabbed 11 passes for 122 yards with one touchdown and contributed on special teams with six tackles.

**TIGHT ENDS**

**TAYSOM HILL.**

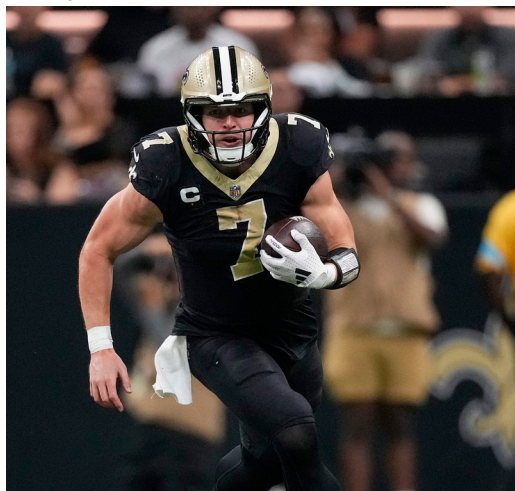
Hill has brought unheralded versatility to the Saints offense and special teams. He's played in 104 games with 48 starts at several positions. He has carried 432 times for 2,427 yards, the most by a Saint not to play running back full-time, with 33 touchdowns, ranked fifth in club records. In the passing game, he has caught 94 passes for 906 yards with 11 touchdowns, completed 193-of-302 passes for 2,369 yards with 11 touchdowns, returned 20 kicks for 489 yards, made a defensive tackle, a forced fumble, 15 special teams tackles and blocked one punt.

Despite missing four games this season with rib injuries, Hill has shown his versatility, starting all seven contests he has played in, carrying 34 times for 268 yards with six touchdowns to tie for the team lead, catching 18 passes for 150 yards and completing two passes for 21 yards. Hill, selected a team captain for the first time, has contributed on several special teams units, forcing a safety on an aborted punt and returning a kickoff for 42 yards.

**ALL-PURPOSE PERFORMANCE**

Hill spearheaded a standout Saints offensive effort in a 35-14 victory over the Cleveland Browns on Nov. 17 to earn NFC Offensive Player of the Week, where he carried seven times for career-high 138 yards [team record 19.7 avg.] with a career-high-tying three touchdowns, including a career-long 75-yard rush that ended in the end zone late in the fourth quarter. Hill also caught a career-high and club-best eight passes for 50 yards, completed a pass for a 18-yard gain and returned a kickoff 42 yards to finish with 188 total scrimmage yards and 230 all-purpose yards, both career-highs.

On Sunday, Hill became the first player with three rushing touchdowns, 50 receiving yards and one pass completion in a game since former Kansas City Chiefs running back Ed Podolak on November 25, 1971 at Detroit. He also became the first non-running back with at least 125 rushing yards and three rushing touchdowns in a game. Hill is the first non-running back ever with multiple games with at least 100 rushing yards and three rushing touchdowns, previously doing so against Seattle in Week Five [112 yards rushing with 3 touchdowns] of the 2022 season, where he also earned NFC Offensive Player of the Week honors.

## RENAISSANCE MAN

Hill turned in an all-around standout performance in the November 5, 2023 win over the Chicago Bears, where he led the team in rushing, carrying 11 times for 52 yards (4.7 avg.), completed a three-yard touchdown pass to tight end Juwan Johnson and caught four passes for 13 yards with one touchdown.



The dynamic Hill's receiving touchdown made him the first NFL player since New York Giants Hall of Famer Frank Gifford (who retired after the 1964 season) to score 10 or more times each as a passer (11), runner (26) and receiver (10). Since then Hill now has increased his career totals to 33 rushing touchdowns, 11 receiving touchdowns and 11 passing touchdowns.

## BY THE NUMBERS

**1** - With 2,427 rushing yards, 2,369 passing yards and 906 receiving yards, Hill is the only NFL player in the Super Bowl era with 2,000 career passing yards, 2,000 career rushing yards and 900 career receiving yards.

**10** - With 11 career touchdown passes, 11 career receiving touchdowns and 33 career rushing touchdowns, Hill is the first player to have at least ten career passing touchdowns, ten career receiving touchdowns and ten career rushing touchdowns since Frank Gifford (Pro Football Hall of Fame Class of 1977).

**33** - Hill's 33 career rushing touchdowns are ranked fifth in record books.

**33** - Hill's 33 receptions in 2023 set a career-high. In 2024, he has 18 grabs after setting a career-high with eight catches vs. Cleveland on Nov. 17.

**44** - Hill has 44 career touchdowns, ranked ninth in club record books.

**47** - Hill brought back his first career NFL kickoff return 47 yards in a 21-18 win over the Cleveland Browns on Sept. 16, 2018, the longest of his career. In part-time kickoff return duty, he has brought back 20 kicks for 489 yards (24.5 avg.), including a 42-yard runback in the Nov. 17 win over Cleveland.

**6,191** - Hill has accounted a total of 6,191 total yards in his eight-year NFL career (2,369 passing, 906 receiving, 2,427 rushing and 489 kickoff returns).



**JUWAN JOHNSON**

The former Penn State and Oregon wideout joined the New Orleans Saints in 2020 following the NFL Draft and transitioned to tight end his second season in 2021. In 2022, the New Jersey native had a breakout campaign as he appeared in 16 games with 12 starts and finished with 42 receptions for 508 yards and a team-best seven touchdown grabs. Johnson was tied for third among National Football League tight ends in receiving touchdowns. Overall, Johnson’s 17 touchdown grabs since 2021 lead the team.

In 13 games with 11 starts in 2023, Johnson finished with 37 receptions for 368 yards and four touchdowns to lead the position group in all major receiving categories. In his final four contests of the season, three of which were Saints victories, Johnson had 17 grabs for 206 yards and three touchdowns. In 2024, he has 22 grabs for 247 yards.

**BIG TARGET**

Johnson’s 13 touchdown grabs since 2022 are tied for sixth among NFL tight ends following his 16-yard scoring grab in the season opener.

**FOSTER MOREAU**

This veteran tight end and New Orleans native who was a standout at Jesuit High School and Louisiana State University signed with the Saints in the 2023 offseason. He finished his fifth National Football League season and first with the Black and Gold after spending his first four campaigns with the Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders, who originally selected him in the fourth round of the 2019 NFL Draft. In his career, Moreau has contributed both as a pass catcher and blocker, appearing in 87 regular season games with 55 starts and has recorded 1247receptions for 1,517 yards [11.9 avg.] with 16 touchdowns, also adding seven special teams tackles.

In his first season with the Saints, Moreau was selected as the club’s winner of the Ed Block Courage Award, recognizing his recovery and return to the field following an offseason diagnosis of Nodular Lymphocyte-Pedominant Hodgkins Lymphoma [NLPHL] at a free agency physical with the team. Moreau returned to the field following the NFL Draft and also battled a nagging ankle injury to play in 15 games with ten starts and recorded 21 receptions for 193 yards with one touchdown.

In 2024, Moreau is tied for the team lead with three scoring grabs on 15 catches for 217 yards [11.9 avg.], starting all 11 games, providing a presence in both the blocking game and the passing game.

**CAMERON JORDAN**

New Orleans' first choice in the 2011 NFL Draft [24th overall] out of the University of California, Jordan has played in 220 career regular season games with 219 starts, recording 792 tackles [486 solo], a franchise record 118.5 sacks for a loss of 784.5 yards, three interceptions, 66 pass breakups, 15 forced fumbles and 11 fumble recoveries. In 2023, despite a lingering ankle injury, Jordan started every contest and recorded 43 tackles [20 solo], two sacks, three pass breakups and one fumble recovery.

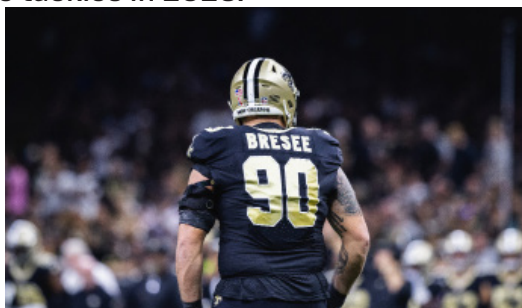

## RAMS VS. SAINTS

### BRYAN BRESEE

The team's first round selection in 2023 out of Clemson after being a three-time All-ACC selection, the Maryland native played in 26 games with 21 starts for the Tigers, producing 54 tackles [35 solo], 15 stops for loss, nine sacks, a forced fumble, an interception and five passes defended.

Bresee immediately found a role in New Orleans' interior rotation and appeared in all 17 games, recording 24 tackles, 4.5 sacks and six passes defended. His takedown total was the highest by a Saints rookie defensive tackle since becoming an official statistic in 1982 and his pass defense total was the most in club records for a rookie at the position since the statistic was officially recorded in 1980, Bresee also tied for second in the league among defensive tackles in 2023.

Bresee is enjoying a breakout sophomore campaign, playing in all 11 games and ranked third in the NFL among defensive tackles with a career-high and team-leading 5.5 sacks.

### CARL GRANDERSON

Signed by New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Wyoming in 2019, Granderson posted 17.5 sacks in college and possesses the prototypical frame for an NFL pass rusher. Granderson has become a significant cog in the team's defensive line rotation with 217 tackles, 27.5 sacks, four pass breakups, four forced fumbles and two recoveries.

Earning the starting right defensive end position in 2023, Granderson posted a career-high 78 tackles [44 solo], led the team with a career-best 8.5 sacks for a 55-yard loss, one pass defense, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery. Through ten games in 2024, Granderson has 38 tackles, 4.5 sacks, ranked second on the team and leading the defensive ends, two passes defended and one forced fumble.

### TACKLES UP FRONT

Granderson's 78 tackles in 2023 ranked fifth in the National Football League among defensive linemen and were the most by a Saints defensive lineman since 2004.

### PAYTON TURNER

With the 28th overall pick in the 2021 NFL Draft out of Houston, the Saints added to the defensive line with this gifted pass rusher. In 18 career games, Turner has recorded 29 tackles, three sacks, one pass breakup one fumble recovery, one special teams stop and one blocked field goal. In 2023, the Texan suffered a toe injury in the season-opening win over Tennessee that would sideline him for 15 contests. However, Turner returned for the season finale vs. Atlanta and recorded the first fumble recovery of his career, showing his promise both with his pass rush and playmaking abilities. Turner is a part of the team's defensive line rotation in 2024 with 12 tackles, two sacks, two passes defended, one forced fumble and two special teams stops.

**CHASE YOUNG**

Originally selected by Washington with the second overall pick in the 2020 NFL Draft out of Ohio State, this talented edge rusher is in his fifth season in the NFL and first with New Orleans. In five campaigns for Washington (2020-23), San Francisco (2023) and New Orleans (2024), Young has appeared in 54 regular season games with 32 starts and recorded 121 tackles (80 solo), 20 sacks, 26 stops for loss, ten pass breakups, seven forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries. The consensus NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year, Young recorded 44 tackles, 7.5 sacks, ten stops for loss and made multiple splash plays with four forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries in 2020. Young played in only 12 games from 2021-22 after suffering a knee injury midway through his second campaign. In 2023, he played in seven games for Washington and nine for San Francisco following a midseason trade and tied his career-best with 7.5 takedowns in helping the 49ers advance to Super Bowl LVIII. Young has fit in with the New Orleans defensive line with 21 tackles, 3.5 sacks, a takedown on a two-point conversion attempt, a forced fumble and one pass defense.

**NATHAN SHEPHERD**

Originally selected by the New York Jets in the third round of the 2018 NFL Draft out of Fort Hays State, this versatile defensive tackle enters his seventh NFL season, his second campaign with the Saints. The Ajax, Ontario, Canada native has appeared in 98 career games with 37 starts, totaling 18- tackles (95 solo) and nine sacks for a loss of 75 yards. In 2024, this valued free agent acquisition has started every game for New Orleans for the second consecutive season and has 27 tackles and a split sack.

**KHALEN SAUNDERS**

Originally selected by Kansas City in the third round of the 2019 NFL Draft out of Western Illinois, Saunders enters his sixth NFL season and second campaign with New Orleans. Signed as an unrestricted free agent in 2023, Saunders combined with two other newcomers in Shepherd and Bresee to form a new interior front, recording career-highs in tackles (57) and solo stops (24). In 62 career regular season games with 26 starts, Saunders has recorded 160 tackles (73 solo), 5.5 sacks, one interception, four pass breakups and five stops for loss.

**LINEBACKERS**



**DEMARIO DAVIS**

This dependable and sure-tackling defender joined the New Orleans Saints in 2018 after spending his first six NFL seasons with the New York Jets and Cleveland Browns. In his career, the Brandon, Miss. native has appeared in 204 regular season games with 190 starts for the Jets (2012-15, 2017), Browns (2016) and the Saints (2018-), recording 1,414 stops (895 solo), 43.5 sacks, three interceptions, 59 pass breakups, four forced fumbles, eight fumble recoveries and 24 special teams tackles.

In 2023, Davis started every contest and again led the Black and Gold in tackles with 121 stops (74 solo), ranked second with 6.5 sacks and added one forced fumble, one fumble recovery and four pass breakups. He joined LB Joe Federspiel as only the second Saint to have 100 stops in six straight seasons, having done so in his last seven campaigns and his tenth season overall of his 12-year National Football League career.

Through ten games in 2024, Davis has 79 stops (35 solo), one sack and four passes defended, despite missing the first game of his career due an injury, ranking first on the team in stops.

**PETE WERNER**



New Orleans selected this three-year starter from Ohio State in the second round of the 2021 NFL Draft. The Indianapolis native finished his college career playing in 47 career games with 35 starts, recording 185 tackles [111 solo], 16 stops for loss, four sacks, 11 pass breakups, four forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Werner helped power the Buckeyes to the College Football Playoff championship game as a senior in 2020, when he was voted by the Big Ten coaches as a first-team All-Conference selection and a Butkus Award semi-finalist, posting 54 tackles, 2.5 stops for loss, one sack and two forced fumbles.

In four seasons, Werner has played in 51 games with 43 starts and has recorded 280 tackles [182 solo], a split sack, one interception, five pass breakups, two forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and three special teams stops.

Werner finished the 2023 season ranked second on the team with 93 stops, a split sack, one interception, one pass breakup and two fumble recoveries, tied for the team lead. In eight games started/played in 2024, he has posted 49 tackles and one pass defense.

**WILLIE GAY JR.**



A contributor on defense for the back-to-back Super Bowl Champion Kansas City Chiefs, this sideline to sideline linebacker joined the Saints at the start of the 2024 free agency period. In five seasons, Gay has played in 67 regular season games with 54 starts, posting 249 tackles [162 solo], six sacks, four interceptions, including one returned for a touchdown, 21 pass breakups, three forced fumbles, six fumble recoveries and eight special teams stops. In nine postseason games played/starts, Gay has accumulated 29 stops, a split sack and three passes defended.

In his final season in Kansas City, Gay played in 16 regular season games with 15 starts for the Chiefs and finished the season with 58 tackles [44 solo], one sack, one interception, four pass breakups, one forced fumble and a career-high three fumble recoveries. In three postseason starts en route to the Super Bowl Championship, Gay collected nine more stops and one pass defense. Despite missing one contest with a hand injury, Gay leads the Saints in 2024 with two fumble recoveries.

**ANFERNEE ORJI**

After originally signed as an undrafted free agent out of Vanderbilt in 2023, where he led the Commodores in tackles in each of his final three seasons, Orji spent his entire rookie season on the club's practice squad. He received the opportunity to see extensive snaps in practice in training camp due to injuries to teammates Davis and Werner. In three preseason contests, Orji led the team with 20 tackles [team-high 13 solo], one stop for loss, two passes defended and three special teams stops, securing a 53-man roster spot. He ranks second on the team with 14 special teams tackles and has added 15 defensive stops.

## SECONDARY

### S TYRANN MATHIEU

This versatile, hard-hitting, playmaking safety and New Orleans native enters his third season with his hometown team, signing after the 2022 NFL Draft. Mathieu has brought experience and leadership to the Saints secondary. He was originally selected by the Arizona Cardinals in the third round (69th overall) in the 2013 NFL Draft out of LSU and has played for the Cardinals (2013-17), Houston Texans (2018), Kansas City Chiefs (2019-21) and Saints (2022-). In 11 NFL seasons, he has played in 174 regular season games with 165 starts and has posted career totals of 815 tackles (664 solo), 43 stops for loss, 11 sacks for a loss of 78 yards, 36 interceptions for 530 return yards, four brought back for touchdowns, 105 passes defended, six forced fumbles, eight fumble recoveries and five special teams stops. Mathieu has been selected to three Pro Bowls, three Associated Press All-Pro teams and the Pro Football Hall of Fame's 2010's All-Decade Team.

In his second season in New Orleans in 2023, Mathieu opened all 17 contests for the second consecutive campaign and finished with 75 tackles (50 solo), four interceptions, tied for seventh in the NFL and the team lead, returned for 122 yards with a TD and nine passes defended.

## THE ONLY ONE

In 2024, Mathieu is his usual playmaking self. Through 11 games, he has opened every contest at free safety and posted 43 tackles (33 solo), three interceptions, six pass breakups, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery. Mathieu is tied for ninth in the National Football League with three interceptions and is ranked first on the club with four total takeaways.

## FOUR IN A ROW

Dating back to an interception in the 2023 season finale vs. Atlanta, recovering a fumble in the 2024 season opener vs. Carolina and picking off Dallas Cowboys quarterback Dak Prescott and Philadelphia Eagles signal-caller Jalen Hurts in Weeks Three and Four, Mathieu recorded a least one takeaway in four consecutive games for the first time in his career. Mathieu is the first Saints defender to record takeaways in four consecutive contests since safety Sammy Knight had at least one in five consecutive contests from Oct. 7-Nov. 4, 2001.



## NOSE FOR THE BALL

Mathieu's 36 interceptions since coming into the NFL in 2013 are first in the league over the period after tying for the club lead with four picks in 2023 and tying for the team lead with three in 2024. Mathieu's 36 career picks are tied with Minnesota's Harrison Smith for the most among active players.

## RAMS VS. SAINTS

### ALONTAE TAYLOR

Selected by the Saints in the second round (49th overall) of the 2022 NFL Draft out of Tennessee, Taylor shook off early injuries to play in 13 games with nine starts and posted 45 tackles (38 solo) and a club-best 11 pass breakups, ranked fourth among NFL rookies.

Moving to the nickel position in 2023, possessing extensive experience on the inside and the outside, Taylor appeared in all 17 games with 13 starts and recorded 75 tackles, his first two career interceptions and a career-high 14 pass breakups, tied for second on the team and ninth in the NFL.

In 2024, Taylor has played in all 11 games with nine starts and ranks second on the team with 65 tackles (47 solo), is ranked third with four sacks and has added 12 passes defended and a team-best two forced fumbles. His four sacks are tied for the most by a Saints cornerback with Alex Molden. His pass defense total is tied for third in the National Football League

### GET A HAND ON

Taylor's 12 passes defended are tied for third in the National Football League, while his 37 since coming into the NFL in 2022 are tied for fourth.

### DB DROP

In the Sept. 8 season-opening win over Carolina, Taylor became the first Saints defensive back to record three sacks in a contest since the statistic was officially recognized by the NFL in 1982. The only other defensive back to record three sacks on kickoff weekend is former Chargers S Rodney Harrison (vs. Buffalo, 9/6/98). After splitting a sack on Sunday at the Los Angeles Chargers, Taylor's four sacks are tied for the highest total by a cornerback in Saints record books with Alex Molden's four in 1997, while the total leads all defensive backs.

## CLEVELAND BROWNS VS. NEW ORLEANS SAINTS SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 10, 2024 • CAESARS SUPERDOME

- The Saints secured their fourth win of the season over the Cleveland Browns 35-14 on Sunday. Following a Week 12 bye, they will return to action on December 1, when they host the Los Angeles Rams at the Caesars Superdome. Kickoff is at 3:05 p.m. CT and the contest will be regionally televised on FOX (broadcast locally on WVUE FOX 8).
- New Orleans improved their regular season record against the Browns to 7-13 and even up their record against Cleveland at the Caesars Superdome to 4-4.
- Dating back to a September 18, 2018, 20-18 win over the Browns at the Superdome, the win today gives the Black and Gold a three-game winning streak against Cleveland, matching a prior three-game winning streak against the Browns in the series from October 28, 1984-October 14, 1990.
- The win evened up New Orleans' home record in 2024 to 3-3. All-time, the win improved their home regular season record to 224-223-1.
- Interim Head Coach **Darren Rizzi** improved to 2-0 as a head coach, joining Sean Payton (2006) as the only two Saints head coaches to win their first two games.
- Today's win improves the Saints' record to 2-1 in the month of November. This marks the first winning record by New Orleans in the month of November since they went 5-0 in 2020, also the first time since that season the team has won multiple games in November.
- The Saints gained a season-high 473 total net yards. New Orleans outrushed the Browns 214-66, setting a season-high for total rushing yards.
- QB **Derek Carr** led New Orleans to back-to-back wins for the second time this season. He finished 21-of-27 for 248 yards with two touchdown passes, zero interceptions and a 129.6 passer rating. Carr also had eight rushing yards on a scramble for a first down.
- With the Saints win over Cleveland on Sunday, Carr improved his record as a starter against the Browns to 5-1 and extended the winning streak against Cleveland to five games.

- Carr now has 255 career touchdown passes, surpassing Joe Flacco and Pro Football Hall of Fame signal-caller Dan Fouts (Class of 1993) all-time, and is now in a tie for 22nd in league history with Pro Football Hall of Fame passer Sonny Jurgensen (Class of 1983).

- Carr's two touchdown strikes were to Saints WR **Marquez Valdes-Scantling** and TE **Juwan Johnson**. Carr and Valdes-Scantling connected on 71-yard bomb, and Carr extended the lead as he threw it to Johnson for the one-yard score.

- The last time the Saints had two straight games with pass plays of 60-plus yards was in 2014 when QB Drew Brees connected with WR Joe Morgan for 62 yards vs. Baltimore on November 24 and WR Kenny Stills had a 69-yard touchdown grab from Brees on November 30, at Pittsburgh. The last individual to have receptions over 60 yards in consecutive games was RB Reggie Bush (2006), when he had a 74-yard reception vs. San Francisco on December 3 and a 61-yard touchdown grab at Dallas on December 10.

- TE **Taysom Hill** contributed significantly on offense and on special teams. He went one-of two for 18 yards and an interception, but surpassed his career-high in receptions with eight grabs for 50 yards and carried seven times for a career-high 138 yards (career-high 19.7 avg.) with three touchdowns, to tie a career-high. Hill finished with a career-high 188 yards from scrimmage. With a 42-yard kickoff return, the longest kickoff return of the season for the Saints, Hill finished with a career-high 230 all-purpose yards.

- With Hill's three touchdowns on Sunday to increase his career total to 44, he surpassed Pierre Thomas in the club record books in career touchdowns, moving into sole possession of ninth place. He also played in his 104th career game on Sunday, moving into a tie for 52nd on the club's all-time games played list with DL/LB Renaldo Turnbull.

- Hill became the first player with three rushing touchdowns, 50 receiving yards and one pass completion in a game since former Kansas City Chiefs RB Ed Podolak on November 25, 1971 at Detroit.

- RB **Alvin Kamara** continued to be productive in the Saints backfield with 16 carries for 67 yards while adding four receptions for 22 yards receiving. With 1,225 yards from scrimmage on the season, he surpassed the 1,160 yards he reached in 2023.

- With his 67 rushing yards, he now has 6,611 for his career, surpassing former Saints teammate Latavius Murray, Le'Veon Bell, and Lawrence McCutcheon to move into 78th in NFL record books for all-time career rushing yards.

- With his 22 receiving yards on Sunday, he surpassed John L. Williams and moved into 15<sup>th</sup> in the NFL record books for career running back receiving yards (4,642).

- Kamara played in his 112th career regular season game on Sunday and moved into a tie for 36th on the club's all-time list for games played with TE Josh Hill, currently a pro scout with the club.

- In addition to Hill, the tight end duo of TE **Foster Moreau** and Johnson both contributed to the passing attack. Moreau recorded three receptions for 50 yards (16.7 avg.) and Johnson tallied three receptions for 30 yards (10.0 avg.) with the one-yard touchdown.
- WR **Dante Pettis** set a new career-high in punt return yards with 54 and had a career-long punt return with his 53-yarder that set up Johnson's one-yard touchdown grab.
- DT **Bryan Bresee** is now the team-leader with 5.5 sacks in 2024. With his 1.5 sacks on Sunday, he surpassed his rookie total in 2023 of 4.5 and set a new career-high 11 games into the season.
- LB **Demario Davis** led the defensive effort with a club-best and season-high 13 tackles (three solo), including one stop for loss and added two pass breakups.
- With ten tackles in last Sunday's win over Atlanta, Sunday's 13-stop effort by Davis marked the first time as a Saint he had at least ten tackles in back-to-back contests. Davis also surpassed the 750 mark for tackles as a Saint with his 13-tackle effort today (754).
- Davis also played in his 108th game as a Saint and moved into a tie for 42nd all-time in Saints record books for games played with K John Carney and RB Dalton Hilliard.
- DE **Cameron Jordan** played in his 220th career regular season game and moved into sole possession of 20th place in games played among NFL defensive linemen past Pro Football Hall of Fame DT John Randle (Class of 2010) and stalwart DT Jeff Zgonina, recording three tackles, one quarterback hit and one pass defense.
- DEs **Carl Granderson** and **Chase Young** both contributed to the sack total today. Granderson recorded one takedown and Young also had a split-sack against the Browns.
- P **Matthew Hayball** punted three times for 110 yards (36.7 gross avg), including all three downed inside the 20-yard line.
- K **Blake Grupe** drilled all five extra points today, increasing his club-best point total to 75.
- LB **Anfernee Orji** led the special teams units with two stops.
- DB **J.T. Gray** recorded one special teams stop to reach 19 for the season, tying his career-high first set in 2021.

(Opening Statement) “Before I take any questions, I thought we showed great resiliency. Our theme of the week has been *finish*. You look at our entire season and that’s not something we’ve done very well. Coming in today, we were 1-3 in one score games. We have had some leads that we’ve given up. Even last week at times, offensively we weren’t great, but I felt like one of the best things we did today all three phases, hung in there, finished the game (in the) fourth quarter. We talked about three things this week, just keeping the focus on the preparation, talked about winning the line of scrimmage, and we talked about finish, and those were the themes as a team this week. I thought we did all three of those things, and so I thought that was a check mark for all three things. When they tied the game, the momentum started to swing a little bit again, much like last week, and I thought what a great job us, by the team, all three phases in the fourth quarter, we had big plays from every phase. I just thought that was an outstanding job. Again, the crowd was awesome. To get to hear momentum there, we needed them a little bit at the end, we got loud. All of a sudden they’re in a two minute drive. That was great. Kudos to Taysom (Hill) for responding, and, no surprise, that’s Taysom, but a great response from him. I know he was pissed off at halftime because we had a couple of turnovers, the interception and the fumble, but he might be the poster child for the resilience. You look at him come back, bounce back, make some huge plays. We decide to go for it there on fourth and short, he has a touchdown run. Then we’re in a four minute drill and he busts out another long one. So I’m certainly happy as heck that we have that guy on our team. You look at the offensive line, we rushed for 200 plus yards. Our plan was to kind of neutralize Myles Garrett for the game, and I thought we did some of that. But again, big punt return, just plays by everybody. Again, just super, super proud. As I just said to the team, there’s a process every week on how to win the game, and I thought we did a great job there. There were a couple times we had some self inflicted wounds, for sure, with the explosive plays for them and turnovers for us, but kudos to that whole locker room for being able to overcome that.”

(On intentions behind Taysom Hill’s offensive involvement) “I think when you look, at least for the time I’ve been here, I have been here for most of the time Taysom has been. Listen, when he touches the ball, he is on the field, it affects the game tremendously. And he sometimes doesn’t even have to get the ball. Him being on the field and I thought Klint (Kubiak) did a phenomenal job in the way we used him today. He ran it, he threw it, he caught it, and so when you’re defending that, and you’re not sure where he’s going to line up and all that, it neutralizes defense a little bit. You maybe get some more vanilla looks than if he’s not on the field. I think you had, what did he have, eight catches and seven carries and two pass attempts, like Red Grange. Good for him, and good for us, and good for Klint and good for the offensive staff. But no doubt, you want to get the balls to your playmakers and (we) certainly have done such a great job the entire season to keep teams off balance, and it’s not all on one guy, it’s a big deal.”

(On what came up in game assessments of Hill’s involvement) “We looked at some other games this year when Taysom was active, and it wasn’t just me. I think it collectively felt like, ‘Yeah, we’re going to get this guy the ball more and get him more involved.’”

(On whether Hill is playing closer to how he envisioned preseason) “Yeah, I think it’s a fair statement because you look at the first couple of games, he was very, very involved. He obviously then was dealing with an injury. Coming back off of that, I think he’s gotten a little bit more and more involved every week. But if you look at our wins so far this season, I’m going to tell you that Taysom’s numbers are pretty good. So that’s been a theme around here for a long time and, like I said, Alvin (Kamara)’s been kind of carrying a load there. Again, Alvin had some really tough, really good yards today, and to be able to keep the defenses off balance with those two guys is a big thing.”

(On Taysom Hill’s performance at 34 years old) “Yeah, he’s kind of an ageless guy. He keeps himself in phenomenal physical shape, the way he takes care of his body, what he puts in his body, all those things. How he prepares himself off the field, in the offseason, all those things. So, he certainly doesn’t look 34. He looked more like a 24-year-old today, that’s for sure. Now we’ve got to be smart with the usage and play counts and all that stuff, we can’t just sweep it under the rug, his age. But I think the reason he has success is because of what he does for the whole calendar year. His preparation, his nutrition, all those things, so the off-the-field stuff is really impressive with him.”



(On confidence in Taysom Hill after turnover) "At halftime I said to him, 'You're going to continue to get the ball, so we've got to get over it. Let's move on.' Listen, any good player that gets that many touches, you're going to have some negative plays. But he was really taking it personal. I just told him on the way out at halftime, 'You're going to keep getting the ball. So I'm going to need you here.' And fortunately for us, he made some big ones."

(On Kubiak's play-calling rhythm) "It's the second week in a row I thought we had a really great start. And that has been a theme in the games that we (have) played well in, it is kind of getting that ball rolling early on. We get a little stagnant there again in maybe the third quarter, but then we're (having) a really good finish. That was the difference between this week and last week. I thought the offense finished. I thought we had a really good start, maybe a little stale in the middle, but I thought Klint called a great game. And you look at the numbers, Derek (Carr)'s 21-of-27. Again, very efficient, made some good decisions, spread the ball around, so for the second week in a row, his QBR is super high, and just played a really efficient game. But that goes back to the play-calling, so I thought Klint did a phenomenal job of spreading the ball around. Foster (Moreau) had a couple of huge catches, Juwan (Johnson), a couple of huge catches, obviously (Marquez Valdes) Scantling, another big play. It's just a great job of understanding the weapons we have and who should be involved, so a great job by Klint."

(On the overall mood of the locker room) "I think we're starting to get some confidence back. I thought we had a lot of confidence in the beginning of the year. We obviously had a little bit of lull, team wise, and I think they got a swag back, if you will. That makes me so happy, just seeing our guys celebrate, and the culmination of the workweek. We talked about that formula for winning, I talked about buy-in and it's a credit to everybody in the locker room. That's what they have done. Listen, I just love to see the excitement. We're going to have a little downtime now. The guys need it. We went 11 in a row here, it's not easy. These late bye weeks, we kind of get to press the reset button again and see if we can make a push here at the end, one day at a time."

(On gratification) "Listen, it's been a crazy two weeks. I'd lie to you if I said I had to sit down and really think about the whole thing. Maybe I'll do that this week. We've still got a lot of things we need to get done in the office and whatnot. It's gratifying to me to win. So, at the end of the day, to watch these guys prepare these last two weeks and go out there, that's the gratifying part for sure. Just the smiles on the faces in the locker room, that's the gratifying part."

(On Pete Werner's game despite cast) "I told you guys all week, Pete (Werner), every day, there was a little more confidence that he could do it. It was really up until last night where it's like, hey, we're going to pull the trigger here. He had some casting options. We weren't 100% sure if he was going to be able to do it, but he prepared all week, didn't get a ton of reps, but prepared all week. Pete's a very intelligent guy, so I wasn't worried about the mental. I was more worried about if he could finish (and) be effective. All the credit to him. He's out there with that club, still flying around and making plays."

(On the defense containing the run game) "That's a big deal. We made an emphasis all week about the line of scrimmage, but more importantly, our tackling. Our tackling on the year is something that has been really inconsistent, so I saw today some really good examples of tackling in the run game. They ripped off a couple runs here and there, but I thought we really did a great job controlling the line. But more importantly, when the back gets to the second level linebackers and DBs, we did a much better job today tackling. Again, that was an emphasis. They've done a good job, their offensive line, tight ends, running backs have been good for them, so we tried to turn it into a passing game, which we did the second half. That was certainly effective."

(On Foster Moreau's performance) "(Foster Moreau) got dinged up early, too, and credit to him, he came back in the game, but he made some huge catches. The one got taken away from him for the holding call, which was a really great pass and catch, but some huge plays. The one where he was falling down, I remember saying in the headset to the coaches, 'That's an unbelievable catch.' He is kind of off balance, sees the ball late, but he makes incredible catches. That whole tight end room really stepped up."

(On the return game and field position) "First of all, Dante Pettis, great job by him. I think in 11 games, we've had, what, four or five different guys back there catching punts? And I think like seven or eight different guys doing kick returns. We made a decision late in the week to go with Dante because we needed a roster spot. I thought Jermaine (Jackson) did an admirable job when he's been in there, but Dante is a guy that was a really good returner in college. We knew if we could get him out into space, we could make something happen. It's a shame, I saw right in front of me, he stepped out by about an inch it looked like. I thought it might come back so I wasn't really celebrating too much because I knew they were going to see it. But what a great job, gave us great field position to go down and score again. Like I said, all three phases. Then the kickoff side of things, I thought Blake (Grupe) had some really good kickoffs. Coverage was outstanding. We made them field that one line drive, (that) kind of bounced around, I think they started on the 15, coverage was really good. We want to continue to take advantage

of that. To have a 42-yard kick return and, I don't even know how many yards the punt return was (53), but a long punt return, those are huge plays in the game. Momentum swings, so that was really good."

(On seeing Jameis Winston again) "It's always great to see Jameis (Winston), (he) puts a smile on my face, puts a smile on everybody's face. From a personal level, great to see him. Right away, they had an 89-yard touchdown there in the beginning. That was the concern coming in. Jameis is going to take those shots down the field. I thought we did a really good job defending. You're always worried, even when we went up 14, we just can't have an explosive here. No big ones, and all of a sudden they're back in the game. So I thought we did a good job of taking those second half ones away."

(On Juwan Johnson blocking on Valdes-Scantling touchdown) "It's another bounce back moment. We talked about Taysom (Hill), but Juwan (Johnson) had the holding penalty on the long throw to Foster (Moreau), and here again. That guy didn't sulk, he just came back and made a huge play. As that play is going on, I'm not even watching (Marquez Valdes) Scantling run with the ball. I am watching everybody else. I'm looking at Juwan back there, out front, working his ass off to get us into the end zone. That's what the finish part is all about, so when you see examples like that, I think it's awesome. It's in the selfless acts that maybe not everyone understands or sees, but that's just phenomenal. It is just team football, it's a selfless 111 thing that we always talk about. Awesome. Really cool."

(On secret to making opposing kickers miss) "(Laughs). No, but again, those are big plays. I think our rush team has done a phenomenal job. Kudos to Phil Galiano and Marwan (Maalouf). They kind of put that plan together every week and present it. Great job by those guys. We're getting phenomenal effort on that. That shows on film and that's on the kicker's mind, so the rushes from last week, where we blocked one and should have maybe blocked another, it whizzed by (John) Ridgeway's hand, that is on film. It's what kickers, in the operation, they try to speed up a little bit, get the ball out a little quicker. It's a big deal. When you put that effort on film, when you put that thought into the opponent's mind, it's a great job by our unit and the coaching part of it. Great job."

(On Derek Carr's performance this afternoon) "(Derek) played a phenomenal game across the board, extremely efficient. The turnovers are a big deal, I know he didn't throw one interception today. I think he was 21-of-27. Like I said, that's the second week in a row where his QBR is way, way high. I think we only had one sack today, so two weeks, one sack. Just spreading the ball out. And listen, there's a bunch of guys playing out there that haven't really been playing with him the entire year: Scantling, Kevin Austin, Dante Pettis. The timing and the rhythm. Derek does a great job at practice every week. Just another really great job by him."

### QB TAYSOM HILL

(On if he knew who Red Grange was) "I don't. Rizz (Darren Rizzi) did (compared Hill to him)? I don't know. Is that a compliment? I'm just playing."

(On becoming the first player since Ed Podolak in 1971 to have three rushing TDs, 50 receiving yards and one pass completion in a game) "I don't know. That's one of those things, to be honest, that I don't really pay a ton of attention to those things. I know that the guys who played this game before us did a lot for us that are now playing this. To be talked about with those guys means a lot to me. I love this game, but the reality is the guys who came before us laid a foundation for us to be playing in stadiums like this on national television and stuff. I don't want that to come across the wrong way because it does mean a lot to me."

(On what allowed for that feat to happen) "I've always believed in myself. It was one of those games where Klint [Kubiak] and the way the coverage was working out created opportunities for me. I know Rizz talked about it, but I thought Derek (Carr) played a really efficient game. The ball was going where it needed to go, and it was coming out on time. We're really hard to defend when we're doing that. Man, he made a lot of really pivotal plays. Third down, third-and-long, he's making plays."

(On his frustration after the fumble in the second quarter) "I'm disappointed. I was really disappointed at halftime. No one is going to be harder about all these things than I am. I expect more from myself in those situations. Look, they made a couple of good plays. I've got a lot of great teammates, a lot of great friends who I had conversations with. I've played this game long enough, I know that's what those guys on the other side get paid to do. It's one of those things where I had to take a step back and say there's nothing I could do about it now. Right? Let's go do what I can to help us win this game."

(On what Darren Rizzi told him at halftime) "Look, I had a number of conversations. You play in this league long enough, you're going to have moments like that. Certainly, I've had plays that did not go my way prior to this game too. Look, I had conversations with Klint, Rizz, everyone, it is always the same message. It's the same message I echo to teammates too when something doesn't go our way. I'm aware of all of that and am grateful they obviously continue to give me opportunities."

(On being a creative offensive weapon) "We gain some numbers that way, and that's obviously never been a secret. We've done this in those things in the past, and it's been successful. Certainly, that's one of those things that's been advantageous for us. Klint called a great game and created a lot of opportunities for me to make plays. I think as you start to look at what we're doing offensively and the more things we do that way, the harder it is for us to be defended. I think, when you're running the ball well and you are ahead, it creates more opportunities that way. Hopefully, it is something we can continue to do."

(On Coach Darren Rizzi's pulse on the team) "I think Rizz has done a really nice job of communicating with a lot of guys in the locker room. We've had a lot of meetings with him. We've had private meetings, (meetings as a group), whatever. I think he has a really good pulse on what we need collectively as a team to get ready for the football game. I think guys have responded to that and really respect him and his ability to have conversation but then take feedback and make some changes. As I mentioned, guys have responded very positively."

(On being injured and finding balance) "It's a hard thing when you want to be out there with your team, and you go through OTAs, you go through training camp and then you have a tough training camp. You're out there grinding with all your buddies. Then, you get to the season and you're all

excited and you have to sit on the sideline. That's a hard thing to balance mentally, emotionally and so forth. I understand trying to find a balance of making sure that you're available and all of that, but we also need to make sure we're doing everything we can to win football games. I don't know exactly what that's going to continue to look like, but I'm certainly enjoying the more opportunities I get."

## **LB DEMARIO DAVIS**

(On if he's ever had to try to tackle Taysom Hill full speed) "Taysom? We've had some live drills. I don't know if we've ever had to go head-on in the hole and that. I think in those live drills he might have been at quarterback. I'm glad he's on my team (laughs)."

(On the fourth down play) "I believe that it was firstly on 4<sup>th</sup>-and-1, and goal line plays always begin with a knockback. Our defensive line took away the interior run by the way they got off the ball with a low pad level. I believe it was Will Harris. He was man-to-man with the tight end. When the tight end got the block, he got the trigger and that took the fullback or the guard off of me. That opened up the path for me to make the tackle. Still making a tough tackle on a really good running back, to be able to make the play, really set the tone in the game."

(On if he almost had a pick in the game) "Oh my gosh. First of all, I almost had two picks. Almost is the key word. Following last week, almost had a pick, so Amazon, I'm going to be looking tonight or have my wife look tonight on Amazon, Prime Delivery. I've got to get some hands. At this point, we shop so much on Amazon, we might have some delivery that we can get for free. Anywhere online, I know Amazon is going to have them. I need the best hands I can find. At this point, I am shopping for some hands. Amazon, just know I'm going to be looking tonight – Amazon delivery in the box. Don't care how they come, if they come gift wrapped or not, box them up nice, just a pair of hands so that I can have them after the bye week."

(On how the defensive scheme has changed over the last few weeks) "Joe Woods is an unbelievable defensive coordinator. Man, he does (a) really good calling plays and keeping the quarterback in a scramble and the offensive coordinator in a scramble. He does a good job of putting the game in his players' hands. We're able to play free. He comes in with the game plan. He makes sure we feel good about it, and we're able to come into the game with a lot confidence. When he's over there calling the plays, we just trust him and go out and execute. It allows us to play with our hair on fire. Guys have really been playing good football the last couple of weeks. That's good, and down the stretch, we've got to do it."

(On Derek Carr's performance) "Aw man, my boy had a field day out there today. He's a two point guard if you really watch him. He gets his Rajon Rondo on quite a bit, finding players. I was telling him in the locker room some of my favorite plays are to watch him when he rolls out the pocket. He had about an eight-yard run today that was special. He bowed up. He's in the room, so I'm going to give him extra love. The poise that he plays with when he rolls out the pocket, when he's on, he's one of the best ones doing it. He dropped a couple of passes down the field. That 4<sup>th</sup>-and-1 was special and got called back. I think that's my favorite play. When he rolls out the pocket and to see how he can wheel and deal on the fly. They usually have guys at three levels, and I feel like he manipulates the defense in his favor. He did the same thing with a little screen I was telling him about. It wasn't major, but it was pretty cool because he found a way to find a crease between two linemen. You have to think quarterbacks they really have to have some ... I'm not going to say the word ... of steel because you've got Myles Garrett running at you full speed. You have to be able to find a guy and keep your eyes down field with somebody who has plenty of highlights in the league of tearing people's heads off, and he's running at you full speed. To be able to keep your eyes downfield and keep your poise, I just think like, man, you have to give a lot of respect to those guys. I like to see him when he's in a mode like that. I'm glad he's on our side."

(On the overall mood in the locker room) "We're winning. Winning feels good. We want to keep that feeling going. Winning changes everything, and that's what this game is about."

(On Pete Werner) "That's some Walker Texas Ranger toughness right there. Man, me broke his hand last game, had a major surgery. I think he has a steel plate in his hand, and he wraps it up in a club that he tested out in practice. He's like, 'when I hit somebody it still feels like I'm punching a brick wall, but I'm going to tough it out'. He's got my respect. He already had my respect. I already knew he was a tough player. Your hands and feet, those are some very sensitive areas. I know people look at football and are like those are some tough guys. If you stub your toe, it still hurts. If you break a finger

or something, it hurts. For him to be out there toughing it out like that for the team and making some really big plays, it speaks to his toughness and his commitment to the game.”

(On confidence in adverse situations and the change in response recently) “I think it was just an emphasis on the finish that started with Coach Rizzi. He just talked about how we weren’t finishing well, and that was something we had to change. Joe Woods came in and emphasized it and talked about in eight or nine of our losses, we either were tied or had the lead in the fourth quarter. He really challenged us on defense, but we had to finish better. That’s what we’ve been putting on display the last couple of weeks. That was an interesting stat. It was 21-0 in the fourth quarter today. That’s the type of football we have to play. I think it makes the difference.”

(On playing against Jameis Winston) “That’s my brother. I love that man to death. He is a very unique guy, and he’s a memorable teammate. He gives everything that he has, and he has a spirit about him that’s contagious. I think watching him grow, specifically in his relationship with the Lord, his relationship with his family, just being a leader all around, seeing him use his platform properly has been amazing to see. In this game, you’re going to have highs and lows, and it’s all about how you choose to show up every day. He is one guy that if you want to talk about how you show up every single day, he’s as great as they come in that regard. The things that he’s had to endure, the waves and the high highs that he’s had and the low lows that he’s had. When he continues to show up with that spirit, I think that’s an example to the world. If I could show up with his spirit every day, I’d be a better human being. I’m proud to call him my brother. I will praise and honor him on any stage.”

## **QB DEREK CARR**

(On the third-and-one quarterback keeper play) “I thought after that run I was definitely going to beat Taysom [Hill] in the rushing title again today, and I did not, obviously. That was my last one. It was actually a play we had before. This game presented good looks and the coaches, they liked it. It was going to be our first short-yardage calls. I’ve been trying to tell them I don’t mind doing that. Finally, they let me do it, and we got a first down. It was huge for us, for sure.

(On the plan for defending Myles Garrett) “I think it went really well. We made sure we had a plan for him because he’s one of the most dominant players I’ve every played in my 11 years in the NFL. He is insane how good he is. Some of the plays he can make – the strength with the speed with the effort. There’s a play you can watch him against Washington where you watch him on a run play, 50, 60 yards down the field, he’s outrunning DBs. He’s unbelievable. Thankfully, he didn’t decapitate me on the one I was throwing to Foster [Moreau] because he found a way in. I thought our offensive line did an outstanding job. Tight ends, running backs, whatever receivers we had in just different kind of looks, different kind of things you don’t always use in every game but with a guy like that you have to use. I put him up there with the guys I’ve played like Von Miller, Aaron Donald, TJ Watt. They’re just that dominant. I’m going to stop naming people, so someone down the road doesn’t get mad. They just have a way to impact games. You watch the film, and you see him about to get chipped, and he’s hitting the chipper three yards in the air; both feet are off the ground. Then, he’s running through the tackle. Not everybody can do that kind of stuff.”

(On Taliese Fuaga’s performance) “Yeah, what a great challenge for him because we did leave him out there a couple of times. You can’t always chip and do certain things 100 percent of the time. There are certain concepts and routes you live with and just have to do it. I thought what a fantastic job. What an experience for him to go up against one of the most dominant players our league has ever seen to just grow in confidence and continue to get better. He’ll see things he’d want better and all those things. For him to get a taste of playing against Myles and seeing what that’s like and handling himself well – the thing I look for is the body language and the eyes before we go out there in the huddle. On the third down, that’s what I’m looking at, and he’s a very confident young man. His confidence gives me confidence. I’ve been in huddles with guys who are like I don’t know about this play, and that’s not a good feeling as a quarterback. His confidence is definitely years beyond how old he actually is.”

(On the Rajon Rondo comparison) “I love Rondo. I really love Rondo, but I’m a Laker fan. That one’s tough for me. I think any kind of praise from a player like that is very honoring, and I’m humbled by it because for him to say that, he doesn’t just say words. You guys know Demario. He says what he means, so I’m honored that he would compare me to someone like that. We talk about that all the time. Whenever you have players around you, it allows you manipulate coverages. It allows you to look this way, pump and then come back because you know you can get it complete. I have to move



this guy one step. There was one today, and I knew if I was going to throw a certain ball, I had to move that guy one step. If I don't have time to do that, I can't play the position how I want to play it. I'm allowed to do that because of how well our offensive line is playing, how well our guys are on their details about the little things like the landmarks on their routes. You have to catch this ball outside the hash right here. You have to be ready right here when I hit this third step. All that stuff matters. I'm just really impressed by everyone else around me because it gives me such joy everytime I go out there because I know I can play free I know that I'm free to be me, manipulate guys. I know Klint [Kubiak] and (Andrew) Janocko won't like it but sometimes take an extra hitch to move somebody to throw a certain ball and all that kind of stuff. If you don't have time to do those kind of things and guys aren't on the details, it won't matter, and it won't work. I've just been thankful for the guys around me. They have been playing so well that it allows me to be free."

(On how he is feeling health-wise) "I've got to be honest, the end of last year into the beginning of this year, I feel great. I felt like it's been my best football that I've played in my career. I feel confident in that. I feel confident in who I'm playing with. I feel confident in the building that I'm in. They continue to breed confidence into me. That goes a long way for players. I feel like, in my 11 years the last, I don't know how many games, the last have been my best."

(On Taysom Hill's performance) "It's unbelievable what he does and what we ask him to do. He's fullback, lead blocking on inside zones and isos, and then, he's playing fullback on a stretch run. He's playing tight end and then he's at receiver. Then he's at quarterback. Then, he's throwing it 50 yards down the field, then he's running with it. I turn around, and I'm in a no-huddle situation checking plays to hand him the ball at running back. Good luck finding someone who can do all of those things. I knew what kind of weapon he was when I made the decision to come here. It makes it even cooler now playing with him just because he's such a great friend. He's such a great person. Now it is just like, there is nothing wrong with this guy. This guy's awesome, except sometimes I can beat him at golf. That's about all. I can't out-drive him though."

### **Opening comments**

“That game was 14-14 going into the fourth quarter. Then, we didn’t finish in any phase, and that is very frustrating for me, for our players, for our coaches. We have to learn from it and we’ve got to move on, because we’ve got one Thursday night at our place. That is where our focus is going to be on.”

### **On the performance by Jameis Winston**

“I thought that he saw clear. I thought that protection was good, for the most part. Maybe (we had) a couple of sacks on third down. I thought that the protection was good. I thought that guys did a good job of getting open. Obviously, there are plays that we left out there, and we have to do better. I thought that, when given time, he made good decisions.”

### **On Taysom Hill**

“I give credit, obviously, to their players and coaches. They put him into some good spots. He’s a guy that gets your attention. Defensively, you are aware where he is at all times, whether he is a quarterback or (a) tight end. We just did not do a very good job of limiting him, slowing him down, tackling him. We did not (do a good job).”

### **On the direct snaps to Taysom Hill**

“We need to execute in those moments. We’ll look at it and see if there are any things that we can do better and put our guys in position. It certainly wasn’t good enough.”

### **On the missed field goals by Kicker Dustin Hopkins**

“He needs to make those kicks. He knows that. He’s been in this league a long time. He’s kicked for a long time. I believe that he will fix that issue that he had, and he will be fine.”

### **On the effort by Jameis Winston in his return to New Orleans**

“For all of our guys, I think, certainly, the effort’s there, it’s great. The frustrating part is to not come out of here with a win. It doesn’t take away some of those good things. It’s frustrating when you play like we did in that fourth quarter.”

### **On Saints receivers being wide open down the field**

“I’ll have to look at the tape to give you a better answer, other than to say that we just need to execute better.”

### **On Denzel Ward’s performance today**

“Taking the ball away a couple of times, we knew that that was going to be a key down here. We made some big plays on the ball. We need him to play great defense.”

### QB JAMEIS WINSTON

#### On his emotions after the game

"I'm just beyond grateful for the love and support that I have received from this city. This is definitely not the outcome that we wanted. We will continue to fight. We will continue to look better. We are going to look within and be the solution. We have to individually be the solution."

#### On Taysom Hill's performance

"Derek, Taysom, Alvin Kamara, the offensive line did an amazing job. They dominated the line of scrimmage. I know Taysom. He is an amazing player. We used to share reps all of the time. That's just how great of a player that he is. He is tough to plan (against). He is tough to stop. I did not know that he could run the inside zone. He did that well. You are playing against one of the best all-time athletes that the NFL has seen. You have to come with it. He was prepared and he did a great job today. He has always done a great job."

#### On the progress of the offense

"I feel like we just have to finish drives and score touchdowns. We did some good things, but every week you do good things. We have to find ways to finish. I'm going to be doing everything in my power to ensure that we put up enough points for the defense."

#### On getting everyone involved in the offense

"Ken (Dorsey) did a nice job of getting everybody involved. Everyone touched the ball today and that's a great thing from an offensive perspective. We need to continue to work on finishing the game and finishing drives so that we can (be on the) end of celebrating."

#### On the 89-yard touchdown pass to Jerry Jeudy

"He's explosive. When you get the ball into (an) explosive player's hands, then he does that. It was a great call, but we worked on the scramble drill. Both of our touchdowns were on that. We have to continue to find ways to execute that and find ways to finish in the end zone."

#### On today's game
