**THE MATCHUP**

Saints (2-1) start their 2018 trek against teams from the NFC East this week by taking on the New York Giants (1-2) at MetLife Stadium in East Rutherford, N.J. with a 3:25 p.m. CT kickoff. The Saints are currently tied for first place in the NFC South with the Carolina Panthers and Tampa Bay Buccaneers. Sunday's contest will be the first of two straight tilts with NFC East clubs. New Orleans is coming off a 43-47 overtime victory at the Atlanta Falcons.

The win over the Falcons marked another sparkling performance by QB **Drew Brees**, who completed 39-of-49 passes for 396 yards with three touchdowns and a 120.7 passer rating, also rushing three times for seven yards with two touchdowns, including the game-winning quarterback sneak in overtime. Brees became the NFL's completions leader (6,326) and the first player in NFL history with 350 yards passing, three passing touchdowns and two rushing touchdowns without an interception in a single game.

Brees wasn't alone in creating the fireworks in the win at Atlanta. WR **Michael Thomas** had ten receptions for 129 yards, giving him season totals of 38 grabs for 398 yards and three touchdowns to lead the NFL in catches and yardage. No NFL player has had as many catches as Thomas through the first three games of a season. RB **Alvin Kamara** had a career-high 190 total yards from

scrimmage with 16 carries for 66 yards and a career-best 15 receptions for 124 yards. Adding in 16 punt return yards, the workhorse on offense and special teams finished with 206 all-purpose yards. Kamara has an NFL-best 430 yards from scrimmage and leads running backs in receiving and receiving yardage with 30 grabs for 289 yards.

DE **Cameron Jordan** led an inspired effort by the defense with two sacks, as he is tied for the NFL lead with four total takedowns. The Saints defense allowed only 48 rushing yards on 22 carries (2.2 avg.), as they also forced Atlanta to punt on their last possession of regulation to send the game to overtime.

Special teams played a crucial role in the victory for New Orleans as DE **Alex Okafor** blocked a punt in the third quarter that was recovered by LB **Craig Robertson** to set up a short field for a Saints touchdown. P **Thomas Morstead** booted four punts for 202 yards (50.5 gross and 42.5 net avg.) with two placed inside the 20-yard line and K **Wil Lutz** drilled three field goals and four PATs as he moved into the top 10 in club record books in points.

Since joining the Saints in 2006, Head Coach **Sean Payton** is 48-41 (.539) on the road. The Saints are 1-1 under Payton at the Giants, for whom he served as offensive coordinator from 2000-2002 and 4-1 against the Giants overall under his leadership, having scored at least 30 points in each victory.

THE COACHES

Saints Head Coach **Sean Payton** has posted a 114-77 overall record (.597), including a 7-5 postseason mark (.583) after the franchise had won only one playoff game prior to his arrival. Payton holds the club's top win total and winning percentage. He continues to represent the Saints as the model of stability not only within the NFC South, as he is the longest tenured head coach within the division, but also among the most accomplished within the NFL. Only New England's Bill Belichick (2000), Cincinnati's Marvin Lewis (2003) and Green Bay's Mike McCarthy (hired one week prior to Payton in 2006) have been with their teams longer. Payton is also one of just eight active coaches to lead a team to a Super Bowl victory. The others are Belichick, Seattle's Pete Carroll, Oakland's Jon Gruden (Tampa Bay in 2002), Baltimore's John Harbaugh, McCarthy, Philadelphia's Doug Pederson and Pittsburgh's Mike Tomlin. The 2017 Saints yielded an 11-5 regular season record, producing their first playoff berth since 2013, behind a squad led by QB Drew Brees offensively and DE Cameron Jordan defensively, this team featured seven players selected to the Pro Bowl, tied for the most in club history and four draft picks selected to the *PFWA* All-Rookie Team, two more than any other club. With RB Alvin Kamara and CB Marshon Lattimore, the 2017 Saints were the first team to have both the *AP* NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year and Defensive Rookie of the Year since 1967. The Saints defense saw improvement in virtually every major statistical category. New Orleans moved up ten spots in total defense, including from 32nd to 15th against the pass. After ranking 31st in opponent points per game in 2016, New Orleans moved up to tenth in 2017, surrendering only 20.4 points per game. Payton earned a bachelor's degree in communications at Eastern Illinois, where as a quarterback he had 10,665 passing yards, at the time the third-highest total in NCAA Division I-AA history. Payton was inducted into the Eastern Illinois Hall of Fame in September of 2000 and had his jersey retired in a ceremony in September of 2010. He received an honorary doctorate from his alma mater in 2013. Payton was born December 29, 1963 in San Mateo, Calif., and raised in Naperville, Ill., Payton has a daughter, Meghan and a son, Connor.

Pat Shurmur was named the 18th head coach in Giants history on Jan. 22, 2018. A 20-year NFL coaching veteran, Shurmur joined the Giants after a two-year stint with the Minnesota Vikings, including the last 27 games as offensive coordinator. In 2017, he was named the NFL Assistant Coach of the Year by the *PFWA*. This is the second head coaching assignment for Shurmur, who led the Cleveland Browns from 2011-12. Shurmur's been a part of teams that

have qualified for nine playoff berths, won seven division titles, and advanced to Super Bowl XXXIX). In 2017 the Vikings were one of four teams with an NFL-best 13-3 record and won the NFC North title. Minnesota finished 10th in the NFL in scoring (23.9 ppg.), 11th in total yardage (356.9 ypg.), and seventh in rushing yardage (122.3 ypg.) under his tutelage. A native of Dearborn Heights, MI, Shurmur was a four-year letterman at Michigan State at center, earning All-Big Ten honors and All-America honorable mention accolades as a senior (1987). He earned a master's degree in financial administration and was the first-ever graduate student football player at Michigan State.

SERIES HISTORY

The Saints and Giants have met 29 times, with New York holding a 16-13 advantage. The Saints have posted a 4-12 record in contests played in four different stadiums at the Giants and will be looking for their first win at their home stadium since a 30-7 victory on December 24, 2006 and their first victory at MetLife Stadium.

LAST MEETING

New York Giants 16, Saints 13; September 18, 2016 @ MetLife Stadium – Already down one starter in cornerback Delvin Breaux with a fibula injury, a trio comprised of Ken Crawley, De'Vante Harris and Sterling Moore put up a gritty performance against a New York receiving trio comprised of Odell Beckham Jr., Victor Cruz and Sterling Shepard, keeping them out of the end zone after P.J. Williams was forced to depart with a concussion.

In the second quarter, safety Kenny Vaccaro stripped the ball from Giants running back Shane Vereen and it was picked up by linebacker James Laurinaitis at the Saints 36-yard line. On the Giants' subsequent possession, quarterback Eli Manning completed a pass to Cruz that gave the wideout open space, but safety Jairus Byrd and Crawley remained in pursuit and dislodged the ball, which was picked up by Harris at the Saints 16. With the Giants receiving a final possession in the second quarter and in a matchup of the sons of former Saints teammates, linebacker Michael Mauti sacked Manning up the middle and forced

him to cough the ball up and it was recovered by defensive end Paul Kruger at the Giants 25-yard line.

Adversity would hit again when a 38-yard field goal attempt by kick Wil Lutz was blocked by Giants defensive tackle Jonathan Hankins and was recovered and returned by cornerback Janoris Jenkins 65 yards for a touchdown. However New Orleans got the ball back and quarterback Drew Brees completed passes of 17- and 23-yards to help set up a 39-yard field goal by Lutz with seven seconds left in the half to trail by only four points.

The Giants got the ball at the half and advanced to the Saints 35-yard line, but a 53-yard field goal attempt went wide left. While Brown connected on a 48-yard kick later in the third quarter, Brees and the Saints got the ball back and engineered a nine-play, 74-yard drive that ended with a 17-yard connection where wide receiver Willie Snead IV made a jumping grab in the end zone to tie the score. When the Giants got the ball back, they advanced to the one-yard line, but the Saints defense stopped them on two straight run plays and a pass attempt, forcing a 19-yard field goal. Lutz later tied the score at 13-apiece with a 45-yard kick. Following the field goal, the Giants got the ball back with 2:54 remaining at their 25-yard line. Manning completed a pass for a 34-yard gain to Cruz at the Saints-two yard line and the Giants would milk the clock until there were two seconds left and Brown drilled a 23-yard field goal to secure the home-opening victory for the Giants.

SAINTS-GIANTS CONNECTIONS

New Orleans Head Coach **Sean Payton** served on the Giants staff from 1999-2002 including handling offensive coordinator duties from 2000-02. His first season as coordinator in 2000, when the Giants captured the NFC title and went to Super Bowl XXXV, New York scored 328 points - the club's highest total since 1990 - and finished 13th in the NFL in total offense...New Orleans Offensive Assistant **Brendan Nugent** prepped at and coached at Archbishop Stepinac (White Plains, N.Y.) High School...Giants quarterback **Eli Manning** is a New Orleans native who's the son of former University of Mississippi and Saints quarterback and Ring of Honor member **Archie Manning**. He prepped at Isidore Newman (New Orleans, La.) High School and then starred at Ole' Miss, where he became only the fifth quarterback in Southeastern Conference record books to throw for more than 10,000 career yards...New York wide receiver **Odell Beckham Jr.** also prepped at Newman and in three years at LSU, played in 40 games with 34 starts and recorded 143 receptions for 2,340 yards (16.4 avg.) and 12 touchdowns...Saints Senior Defensive Assistant **Peter Giunta** tutored the Giants secondary from 2006-14...New Orleans Vice President of Football Administration **Khari Harby** graduated with a degree in accounting from Rutgers...Giants safety **Landon Collins** is a New Orleans native who prepped at Geismar Dutchtown High School...Saints Defensive Line Coach **Ryan Nielsen** served on the Central Connecticut State coaching staff from 2008-09...Saints Coaching Assistant **Deuce Schwartz** is a Long Island native who played at Union College...New Orleans defensive tackle **Jay Bromley** played at Flushing (N.Y.) High School, was a third round (74th overall) draft pick of the Giants in 2014 out of Syracuse and played four seasons for the club...Giants linebacker **Nate Stupar** played for New Orleans from 2016-17...New Orleans tight end **Benjamin Watson** played for Giants Head Coach **Pat Shurmur** when he was head coach of the Cleveland Browns from 2011-12...New Orleans wide receiver **Ted Ginn Jr.** played for Giants Offensive Coordinator **Mike Shula** in Carolina where he served in the same position for the 2013 and 15-16 campaigns and for Giants Special Teams Coordinator **Thomas McGaughey** when he served in the same position with the Panthers in 2016...New Orleans safety **Kurt Coleman** and linebacker **A.J. Klein** also played for McGaughey in Carolina...Coleman, Ginn and Klein also played with Giants RB **Jonathan Stewart** and tight end **Scott Simonson** in Carolina...Ginn and Coleman were signed in Carolina by Giants General Manager **Dave Gettleman** in Caroli-

na. Gettleman drafted Klein in Carolina in 2003. Stewart and New Orleans center **Max Unger** were college teammates at Oregon...New York outside linebacker **Olivier Vernon** was drafted by Saints Assistant General Manager/College Scouting Director **Jeff Ireland** in 2012 when he was general manager of the Miami Dolphins...Giants cornerback **Eli Apple** and Saints safety **Vonn Bell**, cornerback **Marshon Lattimore** and wide receiver **Michael Thomas** were teammates at Ohio State...Giants Tight Ends Coach **Lunda Wells** is a Baker native, who was a Louisiana Class 5A First-Team All-State offensive line selection at Baker High School, was a four-year starter at guard at Southern. He then played semi-pro football with the Louisiana Swashbucklers, later serving as a member of the LSU coaching staff as an offensive line assistant from 2008-09 and as assistant special teams/assistant to the head coach in 2011...New Orleans safety **Marcus Williams** and New York wide receiver/return specialist **Kaelin Clay** were college teammates at Utah...Giants wide receiver **Russell Shepard** played at LSU and was a teammate of Coleman in Carolina in 2017...Giants wide receiver **Sterling Shepard**'s late father Derrick, played for New Orleans in 1989...Saints long snapper **Zach Wood** and Giants center **Evan Brown** were college teammates at Southern Methodist...New York guard **John Greco** played for New Orleans in 2017. He was also teammates with Watson and Saints linebacker **Craig Robertson** in Cleveland...New Orleans linebacker **Manti Te'o** and New York center **Spencer Pulley** were teammates with the San Diego Chargers in 2016...Saints cornerback **P.J. Williams** and Giants defensive end **Mario Edwards** were college teammates at Florida State. GAME SUMMARIES

WEEK 1: Tampa Bay Buccaneers 48, Saints 40; September 9, 2018 @ Mercedes-Benz Superdome – The New Orleans Saints' 2018 regular season got off to a disappointing start as the Tampa Bay Buccaneers took a 48-40 victory at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome. Trailing by 24 points in the fourth quarter, the Saints rallied behind two **Alvin Kamara** touchdowns, a one-yard run and a seven-yard pass from quarterback **Drew Brees**. The Saints converted two-point plays on both touchdowns. But Tampa was able to run out the clock to claim the road victory.

Ryan Fitzpatrick, filling in for suspended starting quarterback **Jameis Winston**, had one of the most productive games of his career, passing for 417 yards and four touchdowns while rushing for another. Wide receivers **Mike Evans** (seven catches for 147 yards, one TD) and **DeSean Jackson** (five catches for 146 yards, two TDs) did the most damage as the Saints defense didn't force its first punt until 7:42 was left in the third quarter.

The Saints offense kept up for the first half - scoring 24 points - but sputtered at the start of the second half with two punts and a lost fumble (wide receiver **Michael Thomas**) on the first three possessions. In the first half Bucs returned running back **Mike Gillislee**'s fumble 34 yards for a score.

Thomas' fumble was the lone miscue in a record-setting performance as the third-year receiver from Ohio State had 16 catches for 180 yards and one six-yard touchdown. He set the team's single-game receptions record and was the highest receptions total on NFL kickoff weekend all-time. It was his fourth 100-yard game and he moved past 200 career receptions.

The Bucs finished with 529 yards of offense while the Saints had 475.

WEEK 2: Saints 21, Cleveland Browns 18; September 16, 2018 @ Mercedes-Benz Superdome – The New Orleans Saints earned their first win with a 21-18 come-from-behind victory over the Cleveland Browns.

After the two clubs traded field goals in the first quarter, Cleveland kicker **Zane Gonzalez** kicked a 39-yard field goal with 1:55 left in the second quarter to give the Browns a 6-3 lead going into halftime.

To open up the second half, the Cleveland defense forced a three-and-out. **Tyrod Taylor** then led them on a 12-play, 79-yard drive that ended with a one-yard touchdown run by running back **Carlos Hyde** to take a 12-3 lead following a missed extra point attempt.

New Orleans' offensive struggles continued as a promising drive that had the Saints at third-and-one at the Cleveland 40-yard line was derailed when Brees was sacked by **Larry Ogunjobi** for a ten-yard loss to be forced to punt.

Cleveland advanced to the New Orleans 26-yard line on the subsequent drive that entered into the fourth quarter, but a 44-yard field goal attempt by Gonzalez went wide left. The Saints got the ball back at their 34-yard line and Brees engineered a nine-play, 66-yard drive that ended with a two-yard touchdown pass to **Michael Thomas** that put the Saints within two. The two clubs then traded three-and-outs, but **Marcus Williams** picked off Taylor at the Cleve-

land 40 and returned it 22 yards to the 18-yard line. Four plays later, Brees connected with Thomas for a five-yard touchdown with a successful two-point conversion rush by **Alvin Kamara** to give the Saints an 18-12 lead. The Browns answered when Taylor connected with **Andrew Callaway** on a 47-yard touchdown, but Gonzalez's extra point attempt went wide left. Brees and the Saints got the ball back and he led them down the field to set up a game-winning **Wil Lutz** 44-yard field goal with 21 seconds left.

WEEK 3: Saints 43, Atlanta Falcons 37; September 23, 2018 @ Mercedes-Benz Stadium – The Saints improved to 2-1 with this overtime victory at Atlanta, with QB **Drew Brees** becoming the NFL's completions leader, passing for 396 yards and tossing three touchdowns and running for two more, one a fourth quarter seven-yard rush in the fourth quarter, the second a dramatic quarterback sneak to end overtime. RB **Alvin Kamara** and WR **Michael Thomas** also had monster performances, backed by a stout offensive line, DE **Cameron Jordan** had two sacks and special teams made a significant contribution with a blocked punt.

With their first offensive drive at their 25-yard line to start, the Saints marched 75 yards in six plays, with Brees connecting with WR **Ted Ginn Jr.** on a four-yard touchdown pass. Atlanta responded on their second possession of the contest with an 18-yard touchdown connection from QB **Matt Ryan** to WR **Calvin Ridley**.

K **Wil Lutz** booted a pair of second quarter field goals, but Ryan gave Atlanta a 14-13 lead when he connected with Ridley on a 75-yard touchdown. But New Orleans took advantage of a late possession at their 42 and Brees completed quick throws to Kamara and TE **Benjamin Watson** to set up a 45-yard Lutz field goal to give New Orleans a 16-14 lead at halftime.

Atlanta got the ball coming out of the half and they took the lead back on a nine-yard touchdown connection between Ryan and Ridley. Midway through the third quarter, DE **Alex Okafor** blocked a punt by Falcons P **Matt Boshier** and LB **Craig Robertson** recovered the ball at the Falcons 16-yard line. Four plays later, Brees completed an 11-yard touchdown to WR **Cameron Meredith**.

Three plays into the final quarter, RB **Tevin Coleman** capped a 12-play, 82-yard with a five-yard TD reception followed by a successful two-point conversion to give the Falcons a six-point lead. But the Saints put together a lengthy drive, with Brees finding FB **Zach Line** for a one-yard touchdown. Ryan's five-yard touchdown pass to WR **Mohamed Sanu** and a two-point conversion gave Atlanta a seven-point lead, but the Saints marched 81 yards in 11 plays and Brees had a seven-yard rush for a touchdown to tie the score.

New Orleans took the opening kickoff of overtime and drove 80 yards, the game ending with the one-yard quarterback sneak by Brees.

Thomas had ten receptions for 129 yards. Kamara had a career-high 190 total yards from scrimmage with 16 carries for 66 yards and a career-best 15 receptions for 124 yards. Adding in 16 punt return yards, the workhorse on offense and special teams finished with 206 all-purpose yards. Jordan led an inspired effort by the defense with two sacks.

Following the Giants matchup, New Orleans will play their second consecutive NFC East opponent when they host the Washington Redskins on Monday Night Football, on Monday, October 7 at 7:15 p.m., a contest nationally televised on ESPN (WDSU-6 locally). T/G Andrus Peat - Father, Todd, played six National Football League seasons with the Phoenix Cardinals and the Los Angeles Raiders.

Ahead is a synopsis of several returning players and newcomers through the draft, free agency and trade to the 2018 Saints offensive line:

Left Tackle Terron Armstead - The club's first third round draft choice in 2013 out of Arkansas-Pine Bluff, Armstead impressed scouts by running the fastest 40-yard dash time (4.71) by an offensive lineman in the history of the NFL Scouting Combine. He has opened 49 regular season games for New Orleans and four postseason contests, including the first three games of 2018.

Tackle/Guard Jermon Bushrod - A fourth round selection in the 2007 NFL Draft out of Towson, Bushrod developed into a starting left tackle by his third season with the club in his first stint and opened 62 regular season contests at left tackle. After attaining starting experience at guard with the Miami Dolphins, Bushrod returns to serve as the top back-up off the bench. In two games in 2018, he has served as an additional blocker and contributed on special teams as well.

Tackle/Guard Andrus Peat - A first round selection (13th overall) in the 2015 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Peat was considered one of the top college offensive linemen in 2014. In his final season in Palo Alto as a junior, Peat started all 13 games at left tackle and was named a first-team All-American by ESPN.com, *The Sporting News* and SI.com and received second-team honors from the *Associated Press*. In his first three seasons, Peat has played in 42 games with 37 starts, opening a contest at every position except center. In 2017, Peat took a massive step forward, opening 15 contests at left guard and left tackle, also opening the NFC Divisional Playoff at left guard. Headed into his fourth season, Peat made his 2018 debut in the Sept. 16 win over Cleveland. Peat now possesses both a veteran's experience and youthful athleticism, making him a key to the Saints' future success.

Right Tackle Ryan Ramczyk - The Black and Gold used their second first round selection in the 2017 NFL Draft to snag Ramczyk out of the University of Wisconsin, viewed by many as one of the best offensive linemen in the entire draft. The 6-6, 314 lb. tackle moved from Division III Wisconsin-Stevens Point to Wisconsin, and in just one season with the Badgers, he flourished. Ramczyk started all 14 games in 2016 and was a consensus All-American, blocking for an offense that gained 203.1 rushing yards per game and allowing just one sack. Ramczyk figures to make an immediate impact in year two in holding down the right side following after opening all 16 games and both post-season contests in 2017 and being selected as a PFWA All-Rookie.

Center Max Unger - After being acquired by the Saints via trade in the 2015 offseason, Max Unger has anchored the middle of the line for the past three seasons, starting all 50 contests he's appeared in at center and serving as a three-time team captain. A second round draft pick of the Seattle Seahawks in 2009, Unger has been named an *AP* first-team All-Pro in 2012 and is a two-time Pro Bowler. The Hawaii native's opened all 117 regular season contests he has played in since 2009.

Right Guard Larry Warford - Originally selected by Detroit in the third round of the 2013 NFL Draft (65th overall) out of Kentucky, this sixth-year blocker brought size, strength and foot quickness to the Saints' line in 2017, as he started all 14 regular season games and both postseason contests at right guard. New Orleans' rush offense responded to his addition, as the ground game finished fifth in the National Football League as he was named to the Pro Bowl for the first time in his career.

Guard Josh LeRibeus - A third-round draft pick by the Washington Redskins in 2012, LeRibeus had played in 29 games with 13 starts as well as two additional postseason appearances. In signing with the Saints in 2017, he appeared in all 16 regular season games and both postseason contests as a valuable backup at left guard and contributing as a lead blocker. In place of an injured Peat, LeRibeus has opened two games at left guard in place of an injured Peat, the Saints having at least 475 total net yards on both occasions.

Center/Guard Will Clapp - A technically proficient player, who through the combination of size, strength and intelligence, was a three-year starter on the Louisiana State University offensive line, starting all 36 games that he appeared in (13 at center, 12 at left guard, 11 at right guard), earning first-team All-SEC honors at guard and center. Blocking for 1,000-yard rushers in each of his three college seasons, Clapp settled in at center in 2017, where he was a first-team All-SEC selection and a Rimington Trophy finalist.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

DEFENSIVE DRAFT

Over the last four NFL Drafts from 2015-18, New Orleans has shown a commitment to improving the defense, spending 17-of-28 picks on that side of the ball. With nine picks in the 2015 NFL Draft, the Saints picked six defensive players, the most taken since New Orleans chose nine defensive players in a 12-round selection meeting in 1990. Below is an overview of the players selected by New Orleans from 2015-18 on the 53-man roster:

LB Alex Anzalone, Florida (D3b-17) - A 6-3, 241 lb. linebacker, Anzalone showcased plenty of potential at Florida. As a senior, he started the first eight games for the Gators until a broken forearm ended his campaign. Despite the shortened season, Anzalone still ranked third on the team with 53 tackles and racked up three sacks and one fumble recovery. The three-time SEC Academic Honor Roll recipient plays with both physicality and intelligence and made an immediate impact as a starter on the outside from day one in 2017 where he recorded 14 tackles, one sack and one pass defended for being placed on Injured Reserve in Week Five. Anzalone has started contests on both the inside and the outside in 2018

S Vonn Bell, Ohio State (D2b-16) - Selected by New Orleans in the second round (61st overall) of the 2016 NFL Draft, Bell was a consensus All-American and one of the top rated defensive backs in the NFL Draft. As a senior, the Rossville, Ga. native was a Jim Thorpe Award semifinalist after recording 65 tackles and adding two interceptions, one brought back for a touchdown, one fumble recovery and 11 passes defended. During his 2016 rookie season, Bell translated that collegiate success to the NFL with ease, starting 14 games and finishing second on the team with 98 tackles (59 solo) and first on the team with two forced fumbles. In 2017, Bell played in all 16 games with ten starts and had a team-high 78 tackles (57 solo), 4.5 sacks, to tie for second on the team, two passes defended, two forced fumbles and five special teams tackles. In the postseason, he led the team with 17 tackles and one sack.

DE Marcus Davenport, Texas-San Antonio (D1-18) - Davenport joined the Saints with the 14th overall pick in the 2018 NFL Draft after showing potential and production as a pass rusher during his college career at Texas-San Antonio. In four college seasons, Davenport posted 22 sacks, including 8.5 in 2017 when he captured Conference USA Defensive Player of the Year honors. Davenport's strength on the line should be a valuable asset for the Saints front in the future, playing an important role in the club's packages in 2018 as he develops into an every-down player, recording his first career sack in Sunday's win at Atlanta.

DTa Tyeler Davison, Fresno State (D5b-15) - This run-stopping widebody defensive lineman played in 53 career games at Fresno State from 2011-14 and made 28.5 stops

for a loss and 14.5 sacks. After moving into the starting lineup in 2016, Davison continued to improve in 2017, with his 31 tackles (21 solo), one pass defended and two forced fumbles not showing his true value as a run-stopper. In the postseason, he added nine tackles and one sack. In the season opener vs. Tampa, Davison played a key role in New Orleans surrendering only 3.3 yards per carry.

DE Trey Hendrickson, Florida Atlantic (D3c-17) - This former third round draft choice in the 2017 NFL Draft (103rd overall) out of Florida Atlantic brought his raw talent, size, strength and speed to a youthful Saints defensive line. In his first season as a pro the rotational pass rusher appeared in 12 regular season games posting 13 tackles (seven solo), two sacks for 15 yards lost, two passes defended and one forced fumble.

CB Marshon Lattimore, Ohio State (D1a-17) - The 11th overall selection in the 2017 NFL draft and the first corner taken possesses all the traits of a lockdown defender. With his agile, fluid style, Lattimore has the ability to shut down the best wide receivers. He played a critical role in the Black and Gold pass defense unit as a rookie in 2017, as he moved into the starting lineup immediately. In October, he became the first Saints rookie since 2000 to capture NFL Defensive Rookie of the Month, when he had 16 tackles, two interceptions, one returned for a touchdown, five passes defended and a fumble recovery and also captured the award in December. For the regular season, he finished with 53 stops, five picks, to lead NFL rookies and the Saints, tying a team rookie record, a club-best 18 passes defended, a forced fumble and a recovery. Lattimore was the first New Orleans cornerback selected to the Pro Bowl since 1995 and was selected as a consensus Defensive Rookie of the Year.

DT David Onyemata, Manitoba (D4-16) - Possessing a unique combination of size and speed, this Lagos, Nigeria native had an impressive rookie year after becoming the first player from the University of Manitoba to be drafted into the NFL. Despite being extraordinarily new to football, the 2016 fourth round draft pick became a critical member on the interior of the Saints defensive front in 2017, playing in all 16 games for the second consecutive season with six starts, making 40 tackles and two sacks, while adding three more stops in the postseason.

DT Sheldon Rankins, Louisville (D1-16) - Selected 12th overall in the first round of the 2016 NFL Draft, the Georgia native played in 46 games along the line at Louisville from 2012-15, producing 133 total tackles (72 solo), 31.5 tackles for loss and 18 sacks. On Nov. 12, 2017, Rankins recorded his first career interception. In the week 15 win vs. Atlanta, he closed out the contest with a sack. In the NFC Divisional Playoff at Minnesota, Rankins added his first career postseason takedown. In the Sept. 16 win over Cleveland, Rankins posted New Orleans' first sack of the season.

S Marcus Williams, Utah (D2-17) - A three-year starter at Utah, Williams was twice named All-Pac 12 and earned second-team All-American as a junior before declaring for the NFL Draft. In 2016, he tied for second in the conference with five interceptions, despite missing two games due to injury. The defender boasts a dangerous mix of speed, fluidity, and instinct that allows him to read offenses and make breaks on the ball. His athleticism showed in his rookie season in 2017 as he made 70 tackles, four interceptions and six passes defended in the regular season, adding ten more stops (seven solo) and another pick in two postseason contests. In the Sept. 16 win over Cleveland, Williams recorded a key fourth quarter pick.

CB P.J. Williams, Florida State (D3b-15) - One of the most gifted athletes among the Black and Gold, Williams' career was limited in the beginning by missing all but two games in his first two seasons with various injuries, but rebounded from the adversity early in his career to come on strong in 2017, when he played in all 16 regular season games and both postseason contests. An experienced starter from Florida State, who developed into one of the nation's top cover corners as a junior in 2014, Williams finished his college career with 123 tackles (82 solo), four interceptions and 18 passes defended. Williams finished with 47 tackles, his first two career interceptions and nine passes defended in the 2017 regular season in 16 games with six starts, while adding five more stops and two passes defended in the playoffs.

SACK ATTACK

In 2017, while the improvement in the New Orleans defense can be credited to the defensive line, linebackers and secondary as a group, the Saints tied for seventh in the NFL with 42 sacks.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

JUST KICKING IT

Between deep passes for touchdowns and athletic interceptions, players often use their hands to produce the game's flashiest plays. However, the players who use their feet often make the difference between winning and losing, between drilling clutch field goals or flipping the field with a well-executed punt.

K Wil Lutz went undrafted in 2016, joining the Baltimore Ravens for training camp. Prior to the start of the regular season, Lutz joined the Black and Gold and immediately took on placekicking and kickoff duties. Lutz has kicked in 35 games, converting 65-of-77 field goal attempts (84.4 percent) and 104-of-108 PATS (96.3 percent). He has also recorded 119 touchbacks on 200 career kickoffs. His 84.4 percent field goal percentage was best among kickers with at least 50 made field goals in team history. In 2018, Lutz has made six-of-seven field goal attempts, all eight PAT attempts and has recorded 12 touchbacks.

P **Thomas Morstead** was the first punter drafted by the Saints since 1984. The club's fifth round draft choice (164th overall) in 2009 from Southern Methodist University, Morstead has been a weapon in the field position game with his strong leg, outstanding placement abilities and booming kickoffs. In ten seasons, he has a gross average of 47.0 on 538 punts with a 41.3 net and 188 punts inside the 20-yard line, while also booming 259 kickoffs in the end zone for touchbacks. Morstead is ranked 15th on the club's all-time games played list with 145 regular season appearances and his consistency has carried over to the 2018 season, where he's averaged a 48.8 gross punting average and a 44.2 net with four dropped inside-the-20.

RETURN TO SENDER

The New Orleans kickoff return game has found juice through several avenues. In 2018, the club's 25.7 kickoff return average is ranked 11th in the NFL, led by **Taysom Hill**. In 2017, running back **Alvin Kamara** recorded a 106-yard kickoff return for a touchdown in Week 17 at Buccaneers the longest play in team history and also has the ability to be a threat in the return game to go with his game-breaking abilities on offense. COVERAGE/BLOCK UNITS

New Orleans' coverage units have been led the past two seasons by S **Chris Banjo** and DB **Justin Hardee**. Hardee led the team with nine stops and a blocked punt recovered for a touchdown as a rookie in 2017 and Banjo finished with eight tackles and a forced fumble. In the 2018 season opener vs. Tampa Bay, both stalwarts led New Orleans' special teams efforts with two tackles apiece. Hardee and RB **Mike Gillislee** are tied for the club lead with three stops apiece. DE **Alex Okafor** also made a game-changing play in Sunday's win at Atlanta when his third quarter blocked punt that was recovered by LB **Craig Robertson** at the Falcons 16-yard line, set up a subsequent New Orleans touchdown.

QUARTERBACK

DREW BREES

- Since signing with the Saints as an unrestricted free agent in 2006 from the San Diego Chargers, QB Drew Brees has thrown for 4,000 or more yards each season, became the only National Football League signal-caller to throw for 5,000 yards five different times and ranked at or near the top in every passing category, both in single-seasons and over the 13-season period, breaking virtually every club passing record.

- Brees once again kept up the pace in 2017, leading New Orleans to an 11-5 regular season record, the NFC South title and the NFC Divisional Playoff round, completing 386-of-536 passes (72.0%) for 4,334 yards with 23 touchdown passes, eight interceptions and a 103.9 passer rating, adding two rushing touchdowns. He set a National Football League record in completion percentage, ranked first in the league in completions, second in passer rating, third in fourth quarter passer rating (117.6) and fourth in passing yardage.

- He has shown no signs of slowing down in 2018, completing 104-of-129 passes (80.6%) for 1,078 yards with eight touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 122.2 passer rating. Brees is currently ranked first in the National Football League in completions, completion percentage and fourth quarter passer rating (142.0) and third in passing yardage and passer rating.

- Since first signing with New Orleans in 2006 and starting all 193 regular season games he has appeared in, ranked third in club record books for games played, Brees leads the NFL with 59,175 passing yards, 416 touchdown passes, 7,614 attempts, 5,201 completions, a 68.3% completion percentage, 104 games with at least 300 yards passing, 16 with at least 400 yards passing, 452 completions of 25 yards or more and stands at third in the league with a 100.0 passer rating.

- Brees has been selected to play in a team-record ten Pro Bowls as a member of the Saints, with 11 overall berths in the National Football League's all-star game, twice as a starter, including his most recent selection in 2017. His seven consecutive selections (2008-14) as a Saint is tied for first in club history with Pro Football Hall of Fame tackle William Roaf.

- Brees has posted a 114-79 regular season mark in games he has started since signing with the Saints in 2006. In Week 15 of the 2016 season, Brees earned his 100th regular season victory in a Saints uniform. Including his seven playoff victories, his 121 total wins as a member of the Saints make him the winningest quarterback in team history and the NFL's second-winningest signal-caller since 2006.

- In his 18-year National Football League player career during which he has appeared in 252 regular season games, ranked sixth in National Football League record books for signal-callers, with 251 starts, Brees has completed 6,326-of-9,423 passes (67.1%) for 71,523 yards, 496 touchdown passes and a 97.1 passer rating. He's stands as the National Football League's all-time most accurate passer, became the league's recordholder in completions in Sunday's win at Atlanta, is ranked third in passing yardage and touchdowns and ranked fifth in rating.

- The Saints have been led six times in the postseason behind the arm of Brees, who in the playoffs, has started all 13 games he has appeared in, 12 as a member of the Saints. He has completed 354-of-537 passes (65.9 pct.) for 4,209 yards, 29 touchdowns, nine interceptions and a 101.6 passer rating, while posting a 7-6 mark, 7-5 as the starting signal-caller for the Saints from 2006-present.

In seven starts against the Giants (six with the Saints and one with the San Diego Chargers), New Orleans Saints quarterback Drew Brees has posted a 5-2 record, completing 173-of-259 passes (66.8%) for 2,177 yards, 20 touchdowns, four interceptions and a 112.1 passer rating. On November 1, 2015 at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome, Brees tied an NFL record with seven touchdown passes against the Giants in a 52-49 win.

RUNNING BACKS

ALVIN KAMARA

• A talented runner and receiver with a 5-10, 215-pound frame who was selected by the Saints in the third round of the 2016 NFL Draft out of the Tennessee, Alvin Kamara is enjoyed an outstanding rookie campaign. He ranked first on the club and sixth in the NFL in total yards from scrimmage (1,554), second on the team in rushing and receiving, carrying 120 times for 728 yards (6.1 avg.) with eight TDs and a two-point conversion, while catching 81 passes for 826 yards (10.2 avg.) with five TDs and a kickoff return for a TD for a club rookie record 14 total scores, tied for second in the NFL with teammate Mark Ingram. Kamara finished the regular season ranked first in the NFL in yards per carry. In the postseason, Kamara added 188 all purpose yards and two more touchdowns as he carried 21 times for 66 yards with a score and added five grabs for 72 yards and a TD.

• He was the first Saints offensive rookie selected to the Pro Bowl since RB Rueben Mayes in 1986, as an *Associat-*

ed Press second team All-Pro at the Flex position, the clubs' first rookie All-Pro since KR Tyrone Hughes in 1993 and was named *The Sporting News* NFL Rookie of the Year and the *Associated Press* Offensive Rookie of the Year.

FAMOUS COMPANY

With eight rushing touchdowns and five receiving touchdowns in 2017, Alvin Kamara was one of only four rookies in National Football League record books to have at least five rushing touchdowns and five receiving touchdowns, joining three Pro Football Hall of Famers in Doak Walker (1950), Charley Taylor (1964) and Gale Sayers (1964). Adding in his kickoff return touchdown, Kamara joined Sayers as the only rookie in NFL history with at least eight rushing touchdowns, five receiving scores and one return touchdown.

ALVIN TIME

Kamara totaled 81 receptions during the 2017 season, the second-highest total in the NFL among running backs and the highest rookie reception total overall. His 826 receiving yards set a club record for running backs as well.

FB ZACH LINE

• First signed as an undrafted free agent by the Minnesota Vikings, where he spent four seasons, Line contributed to the club's fifth-ranked run game in 2017 after joining the club early in the regular season, as well as on special teams. He enters 2018 having played in 50 career regular season games with 14 starts and has carried 20 times for 53 yards and two touchdowns, as well as adding 12 receptions for 121 yards and three TDs and three special teams tackles. • A talented wideout with a 6-3, 212-pound frame who was selected by the Saints in the second round of the 2016 NFL Draft out of Ohio State, Thomas had an outstanding rookie campaign, leading the Black and Gold with 92 receptions for 1,137 yards and a nine touchdown grabs. He became the first Saints rookie to break 1,000 yards in a season since Marques Colston went for 1,038 in 2006. In 2017, Thomas was New Orleans' receiving leader in catches and yardage, making a club-record 104 receptions for 1,245 yards with five touchdowns to rank third in the National Football League in receiving and making him only the second player in NFL record books, joining Odell Beckham Jr. to have 90 catches in each of his first two seasons and his 196 grabs being the most by a player in NFL history in his first two seasons.

TRE'QUAN SMITH

• The club's third round draft pick in 2018, Smith is a talented wideout with a solid 6-1, 210-pound frame who emerged as one of Central Florida's top weapons over three seasons. From 2015-17, Smith caught 168 passes for 2,748 yards (16.4 avg.) with 22 touchdowns. In 2017, he hauled in 54 grabs for 1,082 yards and 13 touchdowns for the 13-0 Knights. In the Sept. 16 over Cleveland, Smith's 18-yard reception was the first of his career.

TED GINN JR.

• Ginn joined the Saints in the 2017 offseason as an unrestricted free agent in his 11th National Football League season. He has been a member of five teams since being selected with the ninth overall pick in the 2007 NFL Draft by the Miami Dolphins out of Ohio State, and has appeared in 169 games with 73 starts over that period. In his long career marked by big play ability, he has accumulated 5,207 receiving yards off 374 catches (13.9 avg.), recording 31 touchdowns. In his first season in New Orleans, Ginn played in 15 games with ten starts and recorded 53 grabs for 787 yards with four touchdown receptions, carried ten times for 39 yards and brought back 19 punts for 103 yards and five kickoffs for 56 yards. Ginn finished ranked second on the Saints in receiving yardage among the team's wideouts. He also enjoyed his most productive postseason as a professional, opening both playoff contests and making 12 grabs for 187 yards with an 80-yard touchdown and adding one carry for 11 yards. In 2018, he has posted 12 receptions for 135 yards and two touchdowns, also rushing twice for 25 yards.

AGAINST THE GIANTS

In six games against the Giants as a member of the Miami Dolphins, San Francisco 49ers, Carolina Panthers and Arizona Cardinals, Ginn has recorded 13 receptions for 216 yards (16.6 avg.) and four touchdowns. He has also returned eight punts for 154 yards (19.3 avg.) with a 71-yard touchdown.

TIGHT ENDS**BENJAMIN WATSON**

• Originally signed as an unrestricted free agent from the Cleveland Browns in 2013 and brought back in 2018 after spending the last two campaigns with the Baltimore Ravens, Benjamin Watson forms a strong combination at the tight end position with veteran Josh Hill and second-year player Dan Arnold. The former University of Georgia standout and 15-year NFL veteran who originally entered the NFL as a first round draft pick of the New England Patriots in 2004 has career totals of 507 receptions for 5,619 yards (11.1 avg.) with 42 touchdowns in 182 games with 135 starts. Watson has also played in 11 postseason games with nine starts and has added 21 receptions for 222 yards and three scoring grabs.

• Watson has opened all three games in 2018 and leads the team's tight ends with 12 receptions for 134 yards, coming off his best game of the season in Sunday's overtime win at Atlanta, where he posted five grabs for 71 yards (14.2 avg.).

AGAINST THE GIANTS

In three regular season games against the Giants, Watson has opened all three contests and posted 14 catches for 186 yards and one touchdown. He did most of his damage in the game he played against them as a Saint in 2015 when on Nov. 1, he posted nine receptions, seven of which moved the chains for first downs, for a career-high 147 yards (16.3 avg.), including a career-long 46-yard grab with one touchdown.

JOSH HILL

• Signed as an undrafted free agent from Idaho State in 2013, Josh Hill's development has been an asset to the position group, for whom he's played in 74 games with 33 starts, making 70 receptions for 651 yards (9.3 avg.) and ten touchdowns, also chipping in 27 special teams tackles. In 2017, Hill appeared in all 16 games with 11 starts, logging 16 receptions for 125 yards (7.8 avg.) and a touchdown and was particularly effective in the postseason where he made six grabs for 103 yards (17.2 avg.) with a scoring grab.

• In 2018, he has played in all three contests with one start and has posted three receptions for 37 yards (12.3 avg.) in providing Drew Brees with another option in the passing game..

DEFENSIVE ENDS

CAMERON JORDAN

• New Orleans' first choice in the 2011 NFL Draft (24th overall) out of California, Jordan enjoyed another standout season in 2017, recording 62 tackles, a career-high 13 sacks, one interception return for a touchdown, a career-high 11 passes defended and two forced fumbles. Jordan was selected to his third Pro Bowl and was a first-team AP All-Pro for the first time. With 63.5 sacks in eight seasons, Jordan is fifth on the Saints career sack list. Jordan's also proven to be one of the National Football League's best run defenders, as well as being known for generating pressure on quarterbacks that doesn't always show up on the stat sheet.

CLIMBING THE CHARTS

After recording 1.5 takedowns in the November 5, 2017 win vs. the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, Jordan inched to fifth place in club record books. After recording two sacks in back-to-back contests, with four quarterback takedowns in 2018, he would move into a tie for fourth place with his former teammate, the late Will Smith. Jordan also leads the club in the postseason all-time with an additional 3.5 sacks.

Jordan is the only Saint to have at least 7.5 quarterback takedowns in six consecutive seasons, surpassing former Black and Gold linebacker Rickey Jackson, who did so in five consecutive seasons from 1983-87.

In 2018, Jordan is tied for first in the National Football League with three other players with four sacks for a loss of 19 yards, to go with 13 tackles (nine solo), which lead the defensive linemen and two passes defended, which lead the team. He has also played a key role in stopping the run with the club ranking first in the league in opponent yards per carry (3.05) and sixth in run defense (84.3 rushing yards per game).

Jordan has posted 61.5 sacks since he entered the National Football League as a first round draft pick in 2011 and over the past seven seasons is only the second player, joining the Houston Texans' J.J. Watt to have 60 quarterback takedowns and 35 passes defended. During this time, the Saints own a 31-14 record when he corrals a signal-caller, and they boast a 13-1 mark in a multi-sack performance in the regular season, including a two-sack performance in the September 16 win vs. Cleveland and two more in Sunday's overtime victory at the Atlanta Falcons. They have a 2-1 mark in postseason games where he's had a sack.

ALEX OKAFOR

• Selected by the Arizona Cardinals in the fourth round of the 2013 NFL Draft, Okafor joined the Saints in 2017 where he added valuable depth on the defensive line. Okafor has appeared in 56 games with 39 starts in six years, collecting 18 sacks, an interception, three forced fumbles, one fumble recovery, nine passes defended and a blocked punt. In 2017, he had 37 tackles (26 solo), 4.5 sacks to tie for second behind Jordan, four passes defended and two forced fumbles. Recovered from an Achilles injury suffered in Week 11, Okafor re-signed in the offseason opened the 2018 season opener opposite Jordan and has posted five solo tackles and one blocked punt in three starts.

MARCUS DAVENPORT

• Trading up to the 14th spot in the 2018 NFL Draft, the Saints addressed the defensive line and the club's pass rush with this gifted pass rusher, only the second draft choice ever from Texas-San Antonio. During his four collegiate seasons, Davenport notched career totals of 186 tackles (97 solo), 22 sacks, 38 tackles for loss, six forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries, one returned for a touchdown and eight passes defended, finishing his career as the school's all-time leader for stops for loss, takedowns and quarterback hurries (21). In two games for New Orleans, Davenport's posted five tackles (two solo), one pass defended, notching his first sack in Sunday's overtime win at Atlanta.

DEFENSIVE TACKLES

TYLER DAVISON

• This former fifth round draft pick has been a vital part of the Saints line since being drafted in the 2015 NFL Draft (154th overall). The Fresno State product followed up his first two seasons with an even more productive campaign in 2017, helping the defense post 42 sacks, ranking seventh in the league and allowing only 20.4 points per game, good for tenth in the NFL. In 2017, he started all 16 games posting 31 tackles (21 solo), one pass defended and two forced fumbles. Overall in three seasons, the disruptive defensive tackle has 90 tackles (51 solo), 1.5 sacks, two pass deflections and two forced fumbles.

SHELDON RANKINS

- The third defensive lineman selected in the 2016 NFL Draft out of Louisville, Sheldon Rankins started all 16 games in 2017 posting 26 tackles (16 solo), two sacks for loss of 13 yards, one interception, one pass defended and one forced fumble. He helped a defensive unit that went from 31st in the NFL, allowing 28.4 points per game in 2016 to allowing 20.4 points per game in 2017, good for tenth in the league. In his first full season after missing seven contests as a rookie, Rankins' ability to rush the passer from the inside as well as take on double teams proved beneficial in 2017 helping the defense post 42 sacks, ranking seventh in the league, compared to only 30 takedowns in 2016. In 2018, Rankins has 11 tackles (six solo), one sack, two quarterback hits and one stop for loss.

DAVID ONYEMATA

- Onyemata was chosen with the team's fourth round pick (120th overall) in 2016 after a stellar career at the University of Manitoba of the CIS, becoming the first member of the Bisons program to be drafted. Over the course of his rookie campaign, Onyemata appeared in all 16 games and recorded 32 tackles (15 solo). In 2017, he took the next big step in his young career, playing in all 16 games with six starts and posting 38 tackles (18 solo), two sacks and one pass defended, while adding three more stops in two post-season contests. In the first three games of the season with Onyemata starting the last two, he has posted six tackles (three solo).

LINEBACKERS

Key free agent acquisitions in both 2017 and 2018 combined with an extra year of growth for younger players have rendered the Saints linebacking corps a hard-hitting squad with a solid mix of both youth and experience.

ALEX ANZALONE

- One of three third round picks in 2017, Anzalone came to the Saints after a solid career at Florida. In his rookie season, Anzalone started four games on the outside before suffering a season-ending shoulder injury and posted 16 tackles, one sack and one pass defended. In three games with two starts in 2018, he has posted five tackles (four solo).

DEMARIO DAVIS

- This dependable and sure-tackling defender came to the Saints after a breakout 2017 campaign, where he started all 16 games for the New York Jets. Davis enjoyed his best season as a pro posting a team-high and career-high 165

tackles (112 solo), a career-best five sacks, tied for second in the NFL among inside linebackers, three passes defended and one fumble recovery. For his career, the Brandon, Miss. native has appeared in 99 games with 85 starts for the Jets (2012-15, 2017), Cleveland Browns (2016) and Saints, recording 694 tackles (442 solo), 13.5 sacks, one interception, 17 passes defended, two forced fumbles, four fumble recoveries and 24 special team stops. In 2018, Davis has opened all three contests and leads the team with 25 stops (13 solo) and one forced fumble).

A.J. KLEIN

- Signed as an unrestricted free agent from Carolina in 2017, where he spent his first four NFL seasons, Klein has played a significant role in the club's linebacker rotation. Opening 12 games on the strongside for the Saints in his first season with the club, Klein had 54 tackles (37 solo), two sacks, five passes defended and one forced fumble. In three contests in 2018, he has posted 16 tackles (11 solo) and one pass defended, playing a key role in a run defense ranked first in the NFL in opponent yards per rush and sixth in opponent rushing yards per game.

MANTI TE'O

- Coming to New Orleans as a free agent in 2017, Te'o used his four seasons in San Diego to establish himself as a talented, linebacker. A second round pick in 2013 out of Notre Dame where he finished second in the voting for the 2012 Heisman Trophy, In 2017, his first season in New Orleans, he ranked among team leaders with 61 tackles (43 solo), three passes defended and one fumble recovery. Teo has posted eight tackles (four solo) in the first two games of 2018 before being inactive in Week Three with a knee injury.

CRAIG ROBERTSON

- In his first year with the Saints in 2016, Robertson quickly became one of the most important members of the defense. After four seasons with Cleveland, Robertson joined the Saints looking to contribute on defense and special teams, yet his production has outpaced even the highest expectations. Starting 15 games in 2016, Robertson led the team with 131 tackles (100 solo), while adding a sack, four passes defended, an interception, and two fumble recoveries. Robertson continued to be a leader in 2017, as he returned to the starting lineup on the outside and was voted a special teams captain. In 2017 in 16 games with starts in the last 12 contests, he had 77 stops (50 solo) to rank second on the team, two sacks to lead the linebackers, two interceptions to also lead his position group, six passes defended, the forced fumble/fumble recovery and a special teams fumble recovery. In 2018, Robertson was selected as a team captain for the second consecutive season.

DEFENSIVE BACKS

MARSHON LATTIMORE

- Selected by the Saints in the first round (11th overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft, Lattimore captured a starting position in training camp and started all 13 games he appeared in. He totaled 53 tackles (44 solo), a forced fumble, one fumble recovery, five interceptions for 85 yards and 18 passes defended, as he became the youngest Saint (21 years old) ever selected to the Pro Bowl and was selected as the AP NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year.

- In 2018, Lattimore has opened all three contests and has posted ten tackles (nine solo), one pass defended and one forced fumble.

MARCUS WILLIAMS

- After being selected in the second round of the 2017 NFL Draft (42nd overall) out of the University of Utah, this ball-hawking safety had an excellent rookie campaign starting all 15 games he appeared in posting 70 tackles (56 solo), four interceptions and 6 passes defended. Williams led all rookie safeties in interceptions and was second for a rookie safety in total tackles and passes defended, including two picks in the regular season finale. The talented safety posted his first career postseason interception, which was the only interception made by a rookie in the 2017 postseason. CHRIS BANJO

- Banjo joined the Saints in Week 11 after beginning 2016 with Green Bay, to provide depth and competition at cornerback and on the special teams units and has made his mark in both areas in New Orleans. After originally participating in rookie minicamps with Oakland and Pittsburgh in 2012, the 5-foot-10-inch, 207-pounder has played in 61 games with two starts for the Packers (2013-16) and Saints (2016-), racking up 23 tackles (19 solo), an interception three passes defended and a fumble recovery, adding 51 coverage stops and a special teams forced fumble. In his first full season in New Orleans, he played in all 16 regular season games and made four tackles, one interception, one pass defended, one fumble recovery and eight stops and one forced fumble on coverage. In the season opener vs. Tampa Bay, he tied for the team lead with two special teams stops.

KURT COLEMAN

- This smart, versatile veteran safety brings experience and a wealth of knowledge to a young New Orleans secondary. Originally a seventh round pick (244th overall) of the Philadelphia Eagles in the 2010 NFL Draft out of Ohio State, after spending his first four seasons in Philadelphia and one in Kansas City, Coleman recorded 11 interceptions over the past three seasons in Carolina. Overall, for his career, he has appeared in 119 regular season games with 76 starts, posting 505 tackles, two sacks, 21 interceptions, two returned for touchdowns, 29 passes defended, four forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and 34 special teams stops. In 2018, he's posted eight stops (five solo), starting the last two contests.

VONN BELL

• Bell left onlookers impressed with his 2016 rookie campaign, alerting the NFL to his arrival through his hard-hitting play. Playing in every game with 14 starts, he totaled 98 tackles (59 solo) both second on the team. He added four passes defended, a sack, two forced fumbles, and a fumble recovery. Drafted by New Orleans in the second round of the 2016 NFL Draft (61st overall), Bell was a consensus first-team All-American, was voted First-team All-Big Ten and was also a Jim Thorpe Award semifinalist following his junior season at Ohio State. In 2017, he appeared in all 16 games with ten starts in the regular season and posted a team-high 78 tackles (57 solo), 4.5 sacks, to tie for second on the club and lead defensive backs, two passes defended, two forced fumbles and five special teams stops. Bell made his postseason debut in the NFC Wild Card Playoff win over Carolina and led the team with nine tackles, saving his best for last when he finished the Panthers' hopes with a fourth down sack late in the fourth quarter. He led Saints defenders with 17 stops in the postseason.

KEN CRAWLEY

• Originally signed as an undrafted free agent out of Colorado in 2016, Crawley took a significant step in his development in 2017, starting the final 15 regular season and postseason contests. In 2017, Crawley finished with 54 tackles, his first career interception and 17 passes defended to rank second on the team in the regular season and added 13 stops and one pass defended in the postseason.

P.J. WILLIAMS

• Originally a third round draft pick by the Saints in 2015 out of Florida State, Williams has appeared in 19 career games with nine starts for New Orleans, posting 58 tackles, two interceptions and 11 passes defended. In 2018, he's played in three contests with one start and has posted five solo tackles.

K WIL LUTZ

• Lutz made an immediate impact in his rookie season in 2016 after signing prior to Week One. He was named NFC Special Teams Player of the Week twice. Lutz was 28-of-34 on field goals and 49-of-50 on PATs in 2016, and was named to the PFWA All-Rookie team for his efforts.

• Lutz followed up with a strong sophomore campaign. In the regular season, he drilled 31-of-35 kicks, including four-of-five from 50 yards out, and with 47 PATs, finished seventh in the NFL in scoring among kickers with 140 points. Lutz's 31 field goals tied a club record shared by Morten Andersen (1985) and John Carney (2002). His career-high 58 touchbacks were ranked fifth in the league.

- Lutz has kicked in 35 career games, converting 65-of-77 field goal attempts (84.4 percent) and 104-of-108 PATS (96.3 percent). He has also recorded 119 touchbacks on 200 career kickoffs. His 84.4 percent field goal percentage was best among kickers with at least 50 made field goals in team history. Lutz's 44-yard kick with 21 seconds left in the September 16 21-18 win over Cleveland turned out to be the game-winner. He also booted three field goals in the first half of Sunday's overtime win at Atlanta.

In a Week Three vs. Atlanta in 2016, Lutz lined up for and converted a 57-yard field goal with no time left in the first half; that effort tied him for the third longest field goal in franchise history.

New Orleans Saints Head Coach Sean Payton

Conference Call with New Orleans Media

Monday, September 24, 2018

What did you see out of the run game offensively? I know you liked what you saw in the moment, but what improved that you saw after reviewing the film?

"I thought a couple things, I thought that we got to the edge pretty well. I thought we won the battle of the line of scrimmage. That was one of the things we talked about all week and one of the keys to victory. I thought we needed (stops in) short yardage situations (and) we got them. The only goal line run we had a really different look defensively, they weren't in a goal line defense. Fortunately, we were able to score a couple plays later, but clearly the thing that stood out is we won the line of scrimmage against that team on both sides of the ball."

What are your thoughts on on the offense being able to execute these first three games in the most crucial moments in the fourth quarter, as well as in overtime on Sunday?

"You are never happy completely. You are happy to get the win and it was a big drive there, obviously in the overtime period to make it a sudden death (win). There's still a number of things that we have to work on to clean up, but I think the encouraging thing is some younger players are getting these real game experiences and gaining that confidence that you need and that belief that you have to have each time you're on the field (when) you have a chance to do something special. I think we're seeing a lot of young players receive those snaps and those opportunities."

Did those two long touchdown drives that you sustained in the fourth quarter help you in the overtime period? Do you think the Falcons were tired?

"More importantly and I can't speak for Atlanta at all, but more importantly It helps you out defensively relative to time of possession and the total snaps you are defending. When you play a team like Atlanta and the game ends and the rushing yardage numbers come out, part of that is time of possession related and so they were right at 29 minutes (29:20). I think we were at 37 minutes (37:45) and on the road that's a pretty good formula."

Are you allowed to speak with Mark Ingram during a suspension?

"No. No contact with the player. I'll see him a week from today after the fourth week."

I've heard some guys talk about missing his energy. Is that one of the key things that he brings besides what he brings to the football field?

"Well, I think what he brings on the football field is pretty important. It's pretty special. He has juice and is a leader. I think that all of those things make an important player for us. Fortunately, we get him back in a week."

Have you been able to identify anything that's a consistent problem on the explosive plays that the defense has given up? Is there an element of surprise?

"No, we have to be able to stay on top of it. Nothing surprises you in this game. You have to identify what you're doing. There's a mental error or one of the coverage busts. We have to look closely at that. We have to ask ourselves are we doing too much? Are we putting our guys in the best position? That's one thing, that is going to keep coming (up) now. Those deep balls are going to keep coming because if there's only two things happening, a pass interference or completion and there's no interception opportunity, then teams are going to take multiple shots more and more and more. I don't like the fact that we've had one takeaway after three games. I don't think we've caused a fumble one time. So there are a handful of things that need improvement fast."
