

THE MATCHUP

The New Orleans Saints [4-10] notched their second consecutive victory and first home win in over two months in a 20-17 thriller over the Carolina Panthers [7-7]. The club closes out their Caesars Superdome slate on Sunday, when they host the New York Jets [3-11].

Last week, the Saints rebounded from Carolina getting on the scoreboard first on their opening offensive drive by putting together a 17-play, 95-yard drive that took 11:22 off the clock, ending with a four-yard rushing touchdown by rookie running back **Devin Neal** to tie the score. Carolina was able to take the lead on the next drive on a 40-yard field goal two plays before halftime.

Receiving the football out of halftime, the Panthers extended their lead to 17-7 on an eight-play, 70-yard drive that ended with a 32-yard touchdown connection between quarterback **Bryce Young** and wide receiver **Jalen Coker**. New Orleans kept the game within a score though, driving towards the red zone, with kicker **Charlie Smyth** booting a 42-yard field goal.

In the subsequent Panthers drive that spanned the third and fourth quarter, defensive end **Jonathan Bullard** stonewalled Carolina running back **Chuba Hubbard** for no gain on fourth-and-one. Bullard tied for the team lead with six tackles. On getting the ball back, the Saints faced adversity when they failed to walk away with points with quarterback **Tyler Shough** being stopped for no gain on New Orleans' own fourth-and-one attempt from the Carolina 23. The Saints got the ball back quickly though in forcing the Panthers off on a three-and-out.

Shough then engineered a seven-play, 78-yard drive that ended with a 12-yard touchdown pass to wide receiver **Chris Olave**. A sack for a nine-yard loss by defensive end **Chase Young** then cost the Panthers crucial yardage and would eventually force a punt. With 57 seconds of clock to start the final Saints drive, Shough connected with running back **Audric Estime** on a pair of screen passes for a total of 28 yards. The rookie-signal-caller then reached Carolina territory on a 15-yard connection to Olave. Following a draw play by Shough with an unnecessary roughness penalty for 15 yards, the stage was set for Smyth to drill a 47-yard field goal with two seconds remaining, as New Orleans defeated the first place team in the NFC South for the second consecutive week and improved their divisional record to 3-2.

THE HEAD COACHES



Named the 19th head coach in New Orleans Saints history on February 11, 2025 Kellen Moore joined the Black and Gold after serving as the offensive coordinator for the

Philadelphia Eagles in 2024. Under the guidance of Moore, quarterback Jalen Hurts and running back Saquon Barkley both had career years. Hurts finished with a career-high 103.7 passer rating, en route to Super Bowl LIX MVP honors. Barkley, who was named the 2024 National Football League Offensive Player of the Year by the Associated Press, had one of the best seasons on the ground in NFL history, leading the league with a franchise-record 2,005 rushing yards in the regular season. His 2,504 rushing yards including the postseason were a league record, earning Pro Bowl and All-Pro honors. The 2024 Eagles offense ranked eighth overall in net yards per game (367.2) and seventh in points per game (27.2). Philadelphia rushed for a single-season club record 3,048 yards (sixth-best in NFL history) and finished second in the league in rushing yards per game (179.3). Before joining the Eagles in 2024, Moore served as offensive coordinator of the Los Angeles Chargers in 2023 and the Dallas Cowboys from 2019-22 after starting his coaching career as quarterbacks coach in Dallas in 2018. In four seasons as offensive coordinator of the Cowboys, Moore's unit ranked second in the NFL in total offense (391.0 net yards per game) and scoring (27.7 points per game). The Dallas offense was also the league's fourth-best passing offense (264.4 net yards per game) and ranked seventh in rushing offense (126.6 yards per game) over that span.

Moore played quarterback at Boise State (2007-11) before playing six seasons in the National Football League with the Detroit Lions (2012-14), Dallas Cowboys (2015-17).

Personal: Born July 5, 1988, in Prosser, Washington. He and his wife, Julie, have two daughters, Halle and Madelyn, and two sons, Kyler and Beckham. His younger brother, Kirby, is the offensive coordinator at the University of Missouri.

Aaron Glenn was named the 22nd head coach in franchise history by Chairman Robert Wood Johnson on Jan. 22, 2025. A 15-year veteran defensive back, Glenn returns to the Jets after starting his career with the organization as a first-round pick (12th overall) in the 1994



NFL Draft. He played eight seasons with the team (1994-2001) that included two Pro Bowl selections and 24 interceptions, tied for the fourth

Glenn enters his 12th season coaching in the NFL after serving as the defensive coordinator of the Lions the last four seasons (2021-24), previously coaching with the Cleveland Browns (2014-15) and New Orleans Saints (2016-20). In Detroit, he led a defense that helped the team to a 39-28-1 record the last four seasons (2021-24), including a league-best 27-7 record the last two seasons. In his final year in Detroit (2024), Glenn's defense finished in the top 10 in scoring defense and takeaways resulting in a league-best +13.1 points per game differential, the fifth-highest margin by any team in the last 25 years. Detroit finished fifth in the NFL in rushing yards allowed (1,672) and fourth in percentage of rushing first downs allowed (23.3%), while allowing the lowest opposing passer rating (82.0) and second-lowest completion percentage (61.1%). Glenn's defense finished with the lowest third-down conversion rate allowed 32.4%, despite losing five Week One starters to injury each of their first 10 seasons.

Background: Defensive back at Navarro College (TX) 1990-91 and Texas A&M 1992-93. Pro Defensive Back New York Jets 1994-2001, Houston Texans 2002-04, Dallas Cowboys 2005-06, Jacksonville Jaguars 2007 and New Orleans Saints 2008. Served as the General Manager of the Houston Stallions (LSFL) 2012 and as a pro scout and area scout for the New York Jets 2012-13 before his coaching career.

Personal: Born July 16, 1972; Humble, Texas. He and his wife, Devaney, have two daughters Tristen and Rheagan, and a son, Aaron II.

SERIES HISTORY

The New Orleans Saints and the New York Jets have met 14 times, with New Orleans leading the series 8-6. The Saints are 3-3 vs. the Jets in games played in New Orleans.

Two of New Orleans' victories against the Jets have come as shutouts, with the Saints posting 17 shutouts in their 55-year history. Overall, this series has been extremely close, with eight of the 13 contests being decided by seven points or less, five by three points or less.

New Orleans Saints 30, New York Jets 9; December 12, 2021 @ MetLife Stadium - The New Orleans Saints welcomed running back Alvin Kamara back to the lineup and said good riddance to the team's five-game losing streak with a 30-9 victory over the New York Jets on Sunday, Dec. 12 at MetLife Stadium.

Kamara, who had missed the past four games with knee and hamstring injuries, had an outstanding game, scoring on a 16-yard run in the second quarter and running for more than 100 yards for the fifth time in his career. He ran for 120 yards on a career-high 27 carries and caught four passes for 25 yards. His first reception of the game set a NFL record for the most catches by a running back in his first five seasons in the NFL (359 catches).

"I'm back healthy. I think that was the most important thing," Kamara said. "O-line played well. I think we played well overall as a team. ... It looked good, it felt good."

Taysom Hill started at quarterback for the second consecutive game and was 15 for 21 for 175 yards and scored on 2-yard and 40-yard touchdown runs. Kicker Brett Maher was a perfect three-for-three on field-goal attempts, converting from 23, 31 and 37 yards. The Saints had a massive advantage in time of possession, holding onto the ball for nearly 39 minutes.

The New Orleans defense dominated the Jets (3-10), forcing four three-and-outs in the first half. Linebacker Kwon Alexander (two) and DE Carl Granderson had sacks for New Orleans as the Saints kept the Jets out of the end zone, allowing just three field goals. New York was three of 14 on third down attempts and one of three on fourth down.

The Saints played without three players who were put on the Covid-19 list last week - DE Cameron Jordan and RBs Mark Ingram and Ty Montgomery. It was the first game Jordan has missed in his career, ending a streak of 172 consecutive games played.

SEASON GAME SUMMARIES

WEEK 1: Cardinals 20, Saints 13; September 7 @ Caesars Superdome - The Saints fell to the Cardinals in the 2025 opener, despite rebounding from a 20-10 third quarter deficit to come within an end zone throw of a game-tying touchdown.

Heroics on offense, defense and special teams aided the Black and Gold in a promising fourth quarter. With 4:40 left in the contest, Saints DT Bryan Bressee blocked a 46-yard field goal attempt. QB Spencer Rattler then converted a trio of first downs on throws to TE Juwan Johnson and WR Devaughn Vele and a 12-yard scramble by the signal-caller to set up a 28-yard field goal by K Blake Grupe with 2:44 left.

New Orleans then forced a three-and-out, punctuated by a third down sack of Cardinals QB Kyler Murray by CB Alontae Taylor for a 15-yard loss to get New Orleans the ball back with 1:49 left.

Rattler helped advance the Saints to the Cardinals 18-yard line to set up three tries at the end zone, the closest being a laser to Johnson that was broken up by Arizona defenders Jalen Thompson and Budda Baker.

Rattler completed 27-of-46 passes for 214 yards and carried four times for 29 yards. Johnson led the Saints in receiving with eight grabs for 76 yards. Murray completed 21-of-29 passes for 163 yards with two TDs and a 108.8 passer rating, carrying seven times for 38 yards. RB Alvin Kamara's first half 18-yard rushing touchdown was the 1,000th touchdown scored at the Caesars Superdome.

New Orleans outgained Arizona through the air, 208-130, but the Cardinals held the ball for 33:46 of the contest to win the time of possession battle. The loss snapped a six-game winning streak for the Saints in openers. The Saints fell to 15-17 against the Cardinals in the all-time regular season series.

SEASON GAME SUMMARIES

Week 2: San Francisco 49ers 26, New Orleans Saints 21; September 14, 2025 @ Caesars Superdome - The New Orleans Saints dropped their second game of the season to the 49ers, despite bouncing back from a 26-14 early fourth quarter deficit to have a chance of winning the game in the final minutes.

"We've got to play cleaner football, in all three phases," said Coach Kellen Moore. "There's only so many opportunities in these games and you have to value each and every opportunity in all three phases, and when they present themselves you've got to take advantage of them because there's only so many."

An impressive drive and defensive stops paved the way for New Orleans to be back in it in the very end. After going down two scores with 12:18 left in the fourth, quarterback Spencer Rattler and company made some magic happen, converting three first downs to wide receiver Chris Olave and running back Alvin Kamara to set up an eventual three-yard TD to wide receiver Devaughn Vele. The score capped off a 13 play, 71-yard drive in six minutes flat to bring the Saints back within five. After two three-and-out drives by both teams, Rattler led a charge that just fell short. Starting on the New Orleans' six yard-line with 2:40 left, the signal-caller picked up two first downs before the 49ers defense became too much to handle. Rattler completed 25-of-34 passes (73.5 pct.) for 207 yards with career-highs of three passing TDs and a 118.1 rating.

49ers quarterback Mac Jones went 26-of-39 for 279 yards and threw three TDs with a 113.1 passer rating. New Orleans outgained San Francisco on the ground, 121-77, but the 49ers beat the Saints in passing yardage, 344-307, and were 53% (8-for-15) on third down to New Orleans' 36% (four-for-11).

Week 3: Seahawks 44, New Orleans Saints 13; September 21, 2025 @ Lumen Field - New Orleans' season continued to get off to a rocky start, as they fell to the Seahawks at Lumen Field.

The Saints got off to a solid start with the ball first and quarterback Spencer Rattler completed a pass to wide receiver Chris Olave and running back Alvin Kamara gained seven yards to put the team near midfield. However the drive stalled out and the Saints failed to convert on fourth down.

SEASON GAME SUMMARIES

After a Seattle first down, the Saints stopped two run plays for one-yard gains, but DT Bryan Bresee was assessed a 12-yard unnecessary roughness penalty on third down that extended a drive and set up a TD. The Seahawks extended their lead to 21-0 by the end of the first quarter, where rookie WR Tory Horton returned a punt 95 yards for a TD and blocked punt set up a third score.

On a drive spanning the first and second quarter, the Saints got on the scoreboard with a Blake Grupe field goal, but the Seahawks took advantage of a long kickoff return to set up a scoring play of a 14-yard pass from QB Sam Darnold to Horton.

The Seahawks took a halftime 38-6 lead, while the Black and Gold kept up their intensity, holding Seattle to a pair of field goals and recording a turnover, while TE Jack Stoll scored his first touchdown.

Rattler completed 28-of-39 passes for 218 yards with a TD. Olave had a career-high ten catches.

Week 4: Bills 30, Saints 19; September 28, 2025 @ Highmark Stadium - New Orleans faced a 11-point deficit with 6:42 left in the third quarter and was able to cut it to two with 8:53 left in the game, but the Saints never led. New Orleans rushed for a season-high 189 yards, scoring a TD on their first possession for the first time this season. But with Buffalo leading 14-7 in the second quarter, New Orleans was unable to capitalize or score points, when rookie S Jonas Sanker had his first career interception near midfield early in the second quarter. QB Spencer Rattler connected with WR Chris Olave for a three-yard TD late in the third quarter to reduce Buffalo's lead to 21-16, followed by a field goal early in the fourth quarter. But the Bills answered with a four-play, 60-yard drive to gain a nine-point advantage. This was followed by a Saints drive that stalled at the Buffalo 43 on downs and the Bills took advantage of a roughing the punter penalty to hold onto the ball and kick a field goal with 2:12 left.

Week 5: Saints 26, New York Giants 14; October 5, 2025 @ Caesars Superdome - Spencer Rattler was so fired up by the sight of Rashid Shaheed hauling in his deep throw down the right sideline that the second-year quarterback started springing the length of the field to join the celebration.

Rattler's pivotal completion to Shaheed went for an 87-yard touchdown, DB Jordan Howden returned a fumble 86 yards for a score, and New Orleans defeated the turnover-prone Giants 26-14 for the Saints' first win under rookie coach Kellen Moore.

"Probably the fastest I ran all game," Rattler quipped when asked about chasing Rashid to the end zone. "Those plays create energy for the whole team, the whole crowd and we definitely want to have more of those."

Such moments had been rare for New Orleans since late last season, which ended with the Saints on a four-game skid before the Moore era began with four more losses to start the 2025 season.

That changed Sunday against the Giants (1-4) - also the previous team to lose to the Saints last Dec. 8. And after the game, the Saints transformed their home locker room - equipped with a sound system and color-changing LED lighting - into "Club Dub" for the first time since beating the Cleveland Browns on November 17.

"It's been a while since we had the fog and the music playing afterward," Howden said. "I almost forgot how that was."

The 37-year old Moore celebrated his first victory since last season's Super Bowl - a game also played in the Caesars Superdome, when he was Philadelphia's offensive coordinator.

"This is a special group," Moore said, praising Saints players' "resiliency to hang in there through some challenging times the first month."

Rattler earned his first victory in 11 career starts, passing for 225 yards without turning the ball over or taking a sack, while Shaheed finished with four catches for 114 yards for the Saints (1-4).

"It feels good to get that first win," Rattler said. "It was a team win. The defense played great. The offensive line was elite."

Giants rookie quarterback Jaxson Dart, who won his first career start in Week Four, passed for 202 yards and two touchdowns, but also turned the ball over three times, the first when the ball slipped from his hand during a scramble in the third quarter. DE Cameron Jordan recovered the football as Dart, laying across Jordan's legs, disgustedly put both hands over his face.

"We had a lot of opportunities and moved the ball just fine," Dart said. "We hurt ourselves. We just kind of gave this game away."

Dart threw his first two career interceptions in the fourth quarter - both caught by Kool-Aid McKinstry for his first career picks.

New York committed five turnovers in all, none more costly than when RB Cam Skattebo was stripped by DT Bryan Bresee at the Saints 12-yard line, giving Howden the chance to scoop the loose ball on the 14 and sprint untouched the other way early in the fourth quarter.

"It was a game-changing play," Moore said.

Indeed, the Giants were threatening to score a go-ahead touchdown when Howden saw the ball on the ground behind the line of scrimmage, picked it up and recalled thinking, "Just run - run for my life." Dart completed his first five passes for 44 yards, capped by a short TD to TE Theo Johnson. He mixed in a 20-yard scramble with three more completions during New York's next series, which ended with Dart's 15-yard strike to Johnson for a 14-3 lead.

New Orleans closed to 14-13 on Shaheed's TD - the Saints' longest offensive play since 2016.

Shaheed said he tried to make S Tyler Nubin believe he was headed across the field to the left, "and once I saw his hips turn, I broke toward the [right] corner and the rest is history.

It was also Shaheed's sixth career touchdown reception of 53 or more yards, and his third covering at least 68 yards.

After Saints K Blake Grupe missed a 52-yard field goal that would have given New Orleans the lead late in the first half, the Saints got the ball back when LB Demario Davis forced receiver Darius Slayton's fumble at the Saints 35 and S Jonas Sanker recovered.

That led to Grupe's short field goal for a 16-14 Saints lead at halftime.

Week 6: New England Patriots 26, Saints 19; October 12, 2025 @ Caesars Superdome - It's not the fight, it's the finish.

It's not the play it's the precision.

It's not the drive, it's the discipline and details.

The New Orleans Saints (1-5) lost their third one-score game this season in the Caesars Superdome, falling 25-19 to the New England Patriots.

Add that to earlier losses against the Cardinals (20-13) and 49ers (26-21) and the Saints have riddled themselves with "couldas" and "wouldas," not not filled the holes with finished business.

"Tough," cornerback Alontae Taylor said. "I think it speaks volumes for us, though. Teams ain't just blowing us out like we're just trash. I think we're right there, and we've just got to find that hump and just stay consistent with that and try to get some wins under our belt."

Sunday followed a similar pattern.

Quarterback Spencer Rattler was efficient and turnover-free - 20 of 26 for 227 yards with no interceptions, but no touchdowns. New Orleans split success in its two red zone trips - a short field goal by Blake Grupe and a one-yard touchdown run by Taysom Hill - and settled for field goals when drives stalled at the New England 30-, 20- and 36-yard lines.

Grupe's last field goal, a 54-yarder with 13:41 left in the contest, pulled New Orleans to within 25-19. And the defense, which struggled while allowing the Patriots to convert six of 13 times on third down, forced punts on consecutive New England possessions.

The Saints began their final two possessions of the contest at their own 25- and 10-yard lines. The first ended after two plays when tight end Juwan Johnson caught a pass from Rattler over the middle and lost a fumble after a 14-yard gain to the 50, and the second ended after the offense gained 28 yards on five plays.

The Patriots converted one last third down on their final drive - a 21-yard pass on third-and-11 from their own 30-yard line with 2:40 left - that allowed them to run out the clock.

New England QB Drake Maye (18 of 26 for 261 yards and three touchdowns, with no interceptions) had completions of fourth-and-four and third-and-11 (twice) in the second half, while all three touchdown passes came on first down in the first half.

"You're guarding pretty good receivers," Taylor said, noting Maye's ability to extend plays and five receivers extra time to uncover. "They're finding ways, and Drake and them have a pretty good connection."

"So you're just going to find a guy open and throw the ball. We've just got to tighten up on our end. if we've got to cover longer, then we've got to cover longer."

Even though the Patriots didn't convert the game's lone turnover into points, they siphoned 2:45 off the clock and pinned New Orleans deep with a punt. The Saints took possession at their 10 with 5:51 left in the contest.

"It says in the Word, like, don't get tired in doing good," Johnson said. "We have a lot of stuff that we're doing that's good, so don't get tired in doing it. You're going to be rewarded when the time is right. The time isn't right, but one thing we're going to do is just keep working, clean up a few things and that's where we're at."

"Our red zone efficiency needs to be a little better, that's something we're going to clean up and be a little more efficient. I had a turnover, so obviously clean that up."

"The biggest thing is just being better and sound. It's just little things that a lot of people don't see, but we see. We'll clean up, we'll do better, we'll come out with a better attitude and a different result next week."

Several winning elements have been displayed. The Saints continue the quest to minimize - if not eliminate the costly ones.

"At the end of the day we did not take advantage of the opportunities that were presented to us," Head Coach Kellen Moore said. "Every game is going to have those opportunities, and you have got to take advantage of them. They won the turnover ratio, they won some of the situational stuff and that's how this game was decided."

"I have got to find a way for myself to coach better, to put ourselves in better situations to be more successful as a football team. Because there is too much good and not enough in those little margins [to be losing]."

Week 7: Chicago Bears 26, New Orleans Saints 14; October 19, 2025 @ Soldier Field - The piecemeal approach to winning National Football League games continued to fail the New Orleans Saints at the Chicago Bears.

Flashes of effectiveness [defensive stops, a forced turnover, two impressive TD drives] again could not sufficiently puncture a thicker shield of futility [four turnovers including three interceptions, no run game against the Bears, inability to stop the run], and the Saints dropped their sixth game in seven outings, 26-14 to the Bears at Soldier Field.

A promising defensive start included a three-and-out punt to open the game, a field goal allowed after the offense committed a turnover deep in New Orleans territory and an interception off Bears QB Caleb Williams. But that buckled under the weight of 222 rushing yards and two touchdowns allowed on 40 carries.

And an offensive flurry that produced consecutive touchdown drives of 91 and 80 yards, each ending on passes from QB Spencer Rattler to WR Chris Olave, was negated by four Rattler turnovers and an invisible run game [44 yards on 17 carries].

Saints first-year coach Kellen Moore echoed the sound of sameness to explain the outcome.

"The theme of that game...we had our chances," Moore said. "I thought our guys battled. I thought our guys put [us] in really good position in the middle of the game to come back and get ourself back in it. But then we just couldn't keep it going. Credit to those guys – they played better than us, they coached better than us. We've got to find the formula that works."

New Orleans has shown it has the ability to create the elements of the formula. It hasn't been able to create them consistently and sustain them long enough for the scoreboard to reflect the mix.

Rattler [20 of 32 for 233 yards and two TDs, and sacked four times for -24 yards] entered the contest with only one turnover – an interception in September against the Seattle Seahawks – and six touchdowns.

But he was sacked and lost a fumble on the Saints' opening possession, after New Orleans' defense forced a punt on the game's opening drive. And after the Saints punted and Blake Grupe missed his sixth field goal this season to end the second and third drives, Rattler's pass intended for Mason Tipton was intercepted and returned to the Saints 30-yard line to conclude the fourth drive.

Week 8: Tampa Bay Buccaneers 23, Saints 3; October 26, 2025 @ Caesars Superdome - An inspired defensive effort and a quarterback change wasn't enough for the New Orleans Saints on Sunday, as they dropped a 23-3 decision to the Tampa Bay Buccaneers at the Caesars Superdome.

The Saints turned the ball over four times [two interceptions, one a pick-six] to allow the Bucs to solidify their grip on the NFC South at 6-2. The loss dropped the Saints to 1-7.

Rookie Tyler Shough entered the game with 3:57 to play in the third quarter and the Saints down 17-3 and promptly completed his first pass for six yards to Taysom Hill. Shough's first series ended when Tampa safety Antoine Winfield Jr. took the ball away from Saints receiver Chris Olave for an interception. Starter Spencer Rattler was 15 of 21 for 136 yards with a lost fumble and pick-six, leading the Saints to just three points [48-yard Blake Grupe field goal]. Shough finished 17 of 30 for 129 yards.

The Saints defense played exceptional football in the first half, not allowing the Bucs' offense to score while sacking quarterback Baker Mayfield three times and forcing him to fumble once. Tampa had just 80 yards of offense in the first half. The Saints defense also had a goal-line stand and came close to a second one before Tampa scored on a 1-yard dive in the third quarter.

Saints running back Alvin Kamara joined another exclusive list Sunday when he became the fifth running back in NFL history to have 600 or more receptions. He entered Sunday's game against the Tampa Bay Buccaneers needing two receptions to hit the milestone and accomplished that in the final minute of the second quarter. He had two receptions for 24 yards and six carries for 21 yards.

Luke Fortner started at center for the Saints, replacing longtime starter Erik McCoy, who is out for the season with a biceps injury. Running back Devin Neal saw his most extensive action of the season as the Saints played without Kendre Miller, who was lost for the season in Week Seven because of a knee injury. Wide receiver/return specialist Rashid Shaheed had nine receptions for 75 yards and wide receiver Chris Olave also added eight grabs for 63 yards.

Week 9: Los Angeles Rams 34, Saints 10; November 2, 2025 @ SoFi Stadium - It seemed less about what New Orleans didn't do Sunday against Los Angeles, as it was about what the Rams did - clinically, repeatedly and thoroughly - in a 34-10 Rams victory. The Rams (6-2) scored touchdowns on three of their first four possessions, piled up 77 offensive plays and 438 yards, registered a lopsided time of possession advantage (43:53 to 16:07) and prevented the Saints from conjuring much hope in the first NFL start for Saints rookie QB Tylor Shough. Shough displayed moments of promise while completing 15 of 24 passes for 176 yards and his first career touchdown pass, with one interception. But the Rams ball-hogged to a gluttonous level, keeping the Saints offense off the field and helping set the stage for Los Angeles' defense to allow just 40 offensive plays, 224 yards and ten first downs.

And a week after New Orleans' defense played arguably its best game this season in a 23-3 loss to Tampa Bay, it couldn't get off the field (the Rams converted half of their 14 third-down attempts and both fourth down tries, and New Orleans didn't force a turnover and was shredded in the red zone, where Los Angeles scored on four of five trips).

"They controlled so many of the situational football plays," Saints coach Kellen Moore said. "They were able to play a lot more efficiently, run the football better. But third downs, red zone, fourth downs - they were able to control the ball in so many ways." "We didn't get enough shots at it. We didn't get enough opportunities. We've got to play obviously a lot better. A lot of this comes down to the details and the fundamentals of the football game. Sometimes it's a simple game; we've got to play better and give ourselves more opportunities."

"When you look at it, we had 40 snaps on offense - probably an all-time low - and they had 77. So they obviously controlled the ball for much of this game." When the Saints went three-and-out on their first two possessions and the Rams scored touchdowns on two of their last three - a 12-play, 88-yard drive and an 11-play, 62-yard drive that lasted a combined 12:36 - it was a harbinger of things to come. New Orleans manufactured an eight-play, 44-yard drive in the second quarter that ended with a 39-yard field goal by Blake Grupe to cut its deficit to 13-3.

And when the Rams responded with a three-play, 65-yard punch to push the lead to 2-3 with 6:25 in the half, the teams traded possessions - the Saints punted, the Rams missed a field goal - before the Saints countered with their only touchdown.

The six-play, 71-yard drive began with 54 seconds left in the second quarter and included Shough completions to WR Rashid Shaheed (13 yards), TE Juwan Johnson (eight yards), receiver Chris Olave (27 yards), and a roughing the passer penalty that pushed the ball to the Rams' 11-yard line.

On first down from there, Shough found Johnson open a few yards in front of the goal line. Johnson made the catch, spun around a tackle attempt and lunged into the end zone for Shough's first touchdown, and halved the Rams' lead to 20-10 entering halftime.

But that was as far as the momentum went.

Los Angeles opened the second half with an 8-yard touchdown drive that required 16 plays, lasted 9:46 and included two third-down conversions and one fourth-down conversion.

Stafford was sacked twice, by Chase Young and Jonah Williams. Young raised his season total to three sacks in four games, second-most on the team. But Stafford mainly was surgical, completing 24 of 32 passes for 281 yards and four touchdowns, with no interceptions. And with Kyren Williams adding 114 rushing yards and a touchdown on 25 carries, the Saints' defense was in a quandry.

Shough will now look to build off his performance.

"I thought there were some positives that came out of the game from Tylor's perspective," Moore said. "I thought he threw it well. I thought that two-minute drive was big-time football right before the half. Even at the end I thought he made a couple of really good plays to quickly get us down in the red zone and we weren't able to run the football and get a first down."

Week 10: New Orleans Saints 17, Carolina Panthers 7; November 9, 2025 @ Bank of America Stadium - No need to overdramatize the New Orleans Saints' 17-7 victory over Carolina at Bank of America Stadium in Charlotte, N.C. In the grand scheme it was the second win in New Orleans' 10 games and in a business measured by wins and losses, everything based on that reality.

But the tingly feeling that tickled fans, and the music inside Club Dub that Saints players blared inside the Visitors' locker room in Carolina, probably felt and sounded like a mixture of relief and hope. The relief came in the form of a much-needed victory in New Orleans' most complete game of the season, where offense, defense and special teams each ponied up and shared the winnings.

The hope came in the form of a rookie quarterback, Tyler Shough, who made his second career start.

New Orleans' defense came up with two turnovers, held Carolina to 175 yards and produced stops on six of nine third-down attempts; the special teams blocked a field goal and added a field goal; and the offense produced 388 yards and chewed up 33-21 in time of possession on 67 plays.

But Shough, the Saints' second-round pick this year, likely left the biggest imprint. He completed 19 of 27 passes for 282 yards and two touchdowns, with no interceptions. He had touchdown passes of 62 yards to receiver Chris Olave and 30 yards to tight end Juwan Johnson, and added another 52-yard completion to Johnson, as New Orleans (2-8) evened its record to 1-1 in his starts.

"Just a great feeling," Shough said. "I think my favorite moment was just seeing everybody in the locker room, dapping everybody up and just kind of the work that everyone has put in to this point. Just a great team win. The defense, special teams, everybody had an impact on the game."

Week 12: Atlanta Falcons 24, New Orleans Saints 10; November 23, 2025 @ Caesars Superdome

No need to have searched for a rocket scientist or nuclear physicist on Sunday in the Caesars Superdome.

The New Orleans Saints shot themselves in the foot, then tied a hand behind their back, then got in their own way, then...

You get the idea: In a 24-10 loss to Atlanta, which dropped the Saints to 2-9 and prevented their first two-game winning streak this season, describing why was simple because applicable cliches were appropriate. New Orleans committed such self-injury that the Falcons (4-7) only needed to accept the benevolence and not reciprocate.

The Saints missed two field goals and twice didn't score touchdowns after drives advanced to Atlanta's one-yard line, leaving twice as many points on the field as they posted on the scoreboard. The lone touchdown was a 49-yard interception return by safety Justin Reid in the second quarter, pulling the Saints to within 10-7 in a game they never led. "Defense has got to come up with a second turnover," said edge rusher Cameron Jordan, who posted a sack (No. 126 of his career), two tackles for loss and a forced fumble. "I think the games we've won, we've gotten two turnovers quick and easy and gave the offense another chance. I had a sack-strip-fumble, I've got to get that ball."

Had Jordan recovered the first-quarter fumble, with the Falcons facing third-and-ten from their 45-yard line, New Orleans likely would have taken over inside Atlanta's 40, trailing 3-0.

But the Falcons recovered, maintained possession, punted and forced the Saints punt to end New Orleans' ensuing drive.

And the Saints were 0 for 3 in the red zone - two failed drives that reached the 1 and a missed 38-yard field goal attempt by Blake Grupe on a drive that started at Atlanta's 16, following a 75-yard kickoff return by Mason Tipton.

Grupe also missed a 47-yard attempt - both were wide right - in the second quarter and is now 18 of 26 this season.

"It's not working right now," Grupe said. "All I can do at this point is look at, literally everything. Look into myself, first of all, and go from there. But other than just literally continuing to put the work in week by week and day by day, that's all I can do."

Jordan said he can sympathize with the struggles, but also stressed the expectation.

"I have no idea what it's like to be a kicker," Jordan said. "I've seen kickers go 40-for-40, or whatever, and then...I assume it's a mindset thing. When you have a great kicker and he starts missing, I've seen it multiple times. I understand there's a mental aspect to it all, one that I can't relate to. I expect them, just like I expect [edge rushers] Chase (Young) or Carl (Granderson) to be able to do their jobs."

"So, when a teammate is in a rut or something, you can't do anything but uplift them. You have to find a way, as a teammate and as a team, to get yourselves out of a hole."

"Beyond that, when you enter the red zone as many times as we did it today, you have to be able to come out with points, preferably touchdowns. When you have a chance on defense to take over the game, you have to be able to. We were playing a good team; I think we showed we are the better team, and we lost. The better team did not win today, and that's on us. We have to be our best friend and not our worst enemy. We stayed getting in our own damn way."

The Saints held Atlanta to 302 yards of offense and the defense produced stops on nine of 12 third down attempts, but New Orleans' own offensive struggles - 293 yards, 5 for 16 on third down and 2 for 5 on fourth down - counterbalanced the effort.

The frustration glared most at the goal line.

On the opening drive of the third quarter, the Saints drove 73 yards on 13 plays [aided by defensive pass interference] to reach the Falcons' one-yard line. But on third-and-goal from the two, Taysom Hill took a direct snap and gained one yard an on fourth-and-goal from the one, Hill threw an incomplete pass and the deficit remained 16-7 with 7:32 left in the third.

The Saints forced a punt, began the next drive at their 41-yard line and used 12 plays to reach the one. On second-and-goal, quarterback Tyler Shough was stuffed on a sneak. On third down, a direct snap to Hill went through his hands, he recovered at the 12 and thre incomplete. But he was penalized for intentional grounding and, facing fourth-and-goal from the 15, the Saints settled for Grupes' 33-yard field goal with 12:13 left in the fourth quarter.

Atlanta responded with a 49-yard touchdown pass and successful two-point conversion to end its next drive, and that was more than enough.

"Frustrating game," Head Coach Kellen Moore said. "All three phases kind of had different opportunities that, obviously, we missed. It's going to be a big opportunity for us to respond the right way and stick together and keep battling."

Week 13: Miami Dolphins 21, New Orleans Saints 17; November 30, 2025 @ Hard Rock Stadium - As glaringly inefficient as the New Orleans Saints were in the first half of Sunday's game against the Dolphins

at Hard Rock Stadium in Miami Gardens, Fla., it is as spectacularly resilient as they were in a stirring second-half comeback that nearly resulted in a victory.

Nearly

But their 16-0 halftime deficit was just enough to help Miami squeeze out a 21-17 victory over New Orleans, dropping the Saints to 2-10 entering a road game next Sunday against Tampa Bay.

New Orleans' first half included two turnovers (a fumble and an interception by rookie Tyler Shough in his fourth start) and a gashed run defense (112 of Miami's 164 rushing yards) against the Dolphins (5-7), who held the Saints to 63 total yards and one third-down conversion in five attempts in the first 30 minutes.

But the Saints produced one of their best patch jobs of the season in the second half. Shough, who completed seven of 12 passes for 43 yards and was sacked twice in the first half, connected on 19 of 26 passes for 196 yards and two touchdowns in the second half, while the defense didn't allow a touchdown after surrendering one on the opening drive of the game, and limited Miami's offense to 105 yards and a field goal in the final two quarters. "Love the way our guys battled," Saints coach Kellen Moore said. "It was an unfortunate ending, but there's stuff to learn from and grow from during that game, so we'll continue to grow."

New Orleans pulled to within 19-17 on an acrobatic, 15-yard touchdown pass from Shough to Devaughn Vele (eight catches, 93 yards) with 1:17 left, with the 6-foot-5 receiver leaping high and tapping down each foot before falling out of the back of the end zone.

On the two-point attempt to tie, Shough was intercepted by Miami safety Minkah Fitzpatrick who returned it untouched for a Dolphins two-point conversion and 21-17 lead.

Saints K Charlie Smyth, in his first NFL game, then executed a perfect onside kick that Vele recovered at the Saints' 45-yard line, and in two plays New Orleans gained 19 yards to the Miami 36-yard line.

From there, on second-and-1 with 44 seconds left, Shough lofted a pass down the right sideline intended for WR Chris Olave. Olave, escorted by two defenders, made a leaping attempt at the goal line and had the best chance of the trio to make the catch, but saw the ball go through his hands for an incompletion.

Shough threw incomplete again on third down to avoid a sack and on fourth-and-1, Shough's sneak attempt up the middle was stuffed by the Dolphins. Miami took possession and kneeled twice to end it. New Orleans sped up its offensive tempo in the second half, with great benefit.

"I think once we were able to finally get some first downs and get some efficient runs on first and second down and play in some positive yardage situations, the tempo is a byproduct of that and you're able to play with more tempo," Moore said.

It noticeably benefited Shough, whose two turnovers came in the second quarter (Vele said he was to blame for the fumble, for missing a block on the blind side which allowed an undetected Fitzpatrick a strip-sack that was recovered by Miami and returned to the Saints' 37-yard line).

New Orleans held when cornerback Kool-Aid McKinstry intercepted Tua Tagovailoa in the end zone on the next play.

Miami added a field goal to take a 13-0 lead on its next possession before the Saints drove from their 28 to Miami's 24, where on second-and-10 with 1:14 left, Shough was intercepted by cornerback Rasul Douglas, who returned it 38 yards to the Saints' 42. The Dolphins added a field goal as time expired in the half to take the 16-point lead.

New Orleans opened the second half with a 10-play, 65-yard touchdown drive that ended on a 17-yard pass to Olave (four catches for 47 yards), and Shough's two-point conversion run halved the deficit to 16-8.

"Just really proud of our resiliency throughout," Shough said. "We started off too slow, just kind of proud how we battled the whole way. It just sucks, losing. We've got to find the little ways to keep getting better. I think we're progressing well, we've got to shore it up."

Defensively, New Orleans posted four sacks including two by edge rusher Cameron Jordan raising his season total to a team-leading 6.5 and his career total to 128, tied with Pro Football Hall of Famer and Saints legend Rickey Jackson for 17th all-time in NFL history.

Week 14: Saints 24, Tampa Bay Buccaneers 20; December 7, 2025 @ Raymond James Stadium - As the rain and turf at Raymond James Stadium caked cleats, slicked hands and smeared jerseys, Tyler Shough left the field as pristine as he possibly could have on Sunday in Tampa, Fla.

The New Orleans Saints rookie quarterback showed off the goods that made him the Saints' highest drafted signal-caller since 1971 in a 24-20 victory, his second as a starter and the third this season for the Saints [3-10].

Shough ran for two touchdowns - including a lead-taking 13-yarder with 8:42 left - and benefited from a herculean defensive effort. New Orleans' defense forced a turnover and produced five fourth-down stops as the Saints won their second road game this season, each over the top two teams (Carolina and Tampa Bay) in the NFC South Division. "This is why you play football," Shough said, after helping New Orleans raise its record to 2-3 in his starts. "You come in here, in the elements with all your boys, all your teammates and we fought really hard. I was really proud of the O-line, just kind of chugging along the whole way, they did a really good job in protection."

"The defense was making huge stops. I think we did a better job of being a little bit more complementary, and I'm just proud of all of our guys. It took everybody, so it was just a lot of fun. That's the thing that is kind of resonating with me right now, it was just a lot of fun. And I think this shows kind of how we are as a team."

The Saints again proved to be a markedly better second-half team, outscoring the Buccaneers 17-10, going 5 for 7 on third down after blanking on four attempts in the first half, gaining 187 of their 260 yards and producing four stops on third down and two on fourth, including the game sealer with 81 seconds left.

"Coming into it, we just knew they were going to be aggressive," said CB Alontae Taylor, whose third quarter interception set the table for Shough's 34-yard touchdown run, the first rushing touchdown of Shough's career. "With those fourth-down plays, we were expecting them to go for them."

"I think [defensive coordinator Brandon] Staley came up with the right gameplan throughout the week. We communicated on the back end and throughout the whole defense, and we were just able to get the stops."

New Orleans opened the game with a touchdown drive, following WR Mason Tipton's 54-yard kickoff return. Four plays, including completions of 16 and 12 yards to WR Devaughn Vele and TE Juwan Johnson, and an 11-yard read option run by Shough took the Saints to the 3-yard line. On first-and-goal from there, rookie RB Devin Neal muscled in up the middle for his first NFL touchdown.

The Bucs (7-6) responded with a touchdown and neither team scored again until the second quarter. Shough (13 of 20 for 144 yards, with an interception, and seven carries for 55 yards) was picked off on a deep pass attempt on first-and-5 from New Orleans' 21-yard line with 11:20 left in the first half. Tampa Bay's 19-yard return set up the possession to begin at New Orleans' 40, and after gaining 17 yards in four plays, the Bucs settled for a 41-yard field goal and 10-7 lead they carried into halftime. After Taylor's interception ended Tampa Bay's opening drive of the second half and Shough's 34-yard run gave New Orleans a 14-10 lead, the Bucs responded with a seven-play, 65-yard drive to retake the advantage, 17-14 with 7:40 left in the third. The Saints tied it on Charlie Smyth's field goal with 1:36 left in the third quarter, and fourth down stop No. 4 for the Saints (a Kool-Aid McKinstry pass breakup) gave New Orleans possession at its own 47 with 12:48 left.

Eight plays later, including conversions on third-and-10 and third-and-8, and the Saints were first-and-10 at the Tampa Bay 13. Shough dropped back to pass, evaded heavy pressure in the pocket and escaped through an opening on the left side, then outran the defense to the pylon for a 24-17 lead with 8:26 left.

"We were getting Taysom [Hill] on a linebacker for maybe a pylon-wheel shot and it kind of all got muddied up at the end, so I was just trying to get out of there and make a play," Shough said. "Just saw green grass and went for it. It was a good job of driving the whole way down the field and getting down there. Stuff like that happens and you've got to go for it."

The defense made it stand, allowing a red zone field goal before producing its final fourth-down stop - a Demario Davis tackle following a three-yard

completion on fourth-and-4- with 1:21 left. The Saints limited the Bucs to 301 yards and Tampa Bay quarterback Baker Mayfield completed 14 of 30 passes for 122 yards and a touchdown, with an interception.

"We've only won a couple of games this season, there's a lot of adversity you face," Moore said. "And, so, for our guys to come out and have the energy and physicality they played with, I thought it was a credit to our guys."

"They're a special group, a group that keeps playing and all three phases contributed to this game. It was a really challenging game for both teams. It was big for our guys to come away with the win."

Week 15: New Orleans Saints 20, New Orleans Saints 17; December 14, 2025 @ Caesars Superdome - The New Orleans Saints hitched to improbable Sunday and wouldn't loosen their grip until they crossed into possible and landed on victory, posting a 20-17 win over Carolina in the Caesars Superdome that riveted as they scored 10 points in the final 2:29.

The Saints (4-10) won their second consecutive games - their first winning streak this season - and evened their record to 3-3 with rookie Tyler Shough starting at quarterback.

Shough (24 of 32 for 272 yards and a touchdown, with no interceptions) threw a 12-yard touchdown pass to receiver Chris Olave with 2:29 left to tie the score at 17-17. After the defense forced a punt, Shough led an eight-play, 62-yard drive that lasted 55 seconds and ended with Charlie Smyth's 47-yard field goal with two seconds left.

"Tyler Shough, he's building," said edge rusher Chase Young, whose nine-yard sack on Carolina's final possession helped force the punt. Young added two tackles for loss and two quarterback hits, but lauded the work of the Saints' rookie quarterback.

"Every week, I can tell he's getting more comfortable," Young said. "He's just starting to look like that guy."

Smyth, too, as assumed the look of a solid NFL kicker. he has made four of his last five kicks (he added a 42-yarder Sunday), and the game-winner was pure.

"We have a great operation," Smyth said. "I never have to think about the ball being in the right spot or with the right hold. It was a cool moment, and one I'll never forget."

Smyth was the Saints' kicker for the third straight game and with the Saints.

His game-winner gave New Orleans its second one-score victory in as many weeks over the NFC South Division leader. Last week, it was a 24-20 road win against Tampa Bay.

Adding to the degree of difficulty against Carolina [7-7], the Saints waded through attrition - running back Devin Neal [hamstring], receiver Devaughn Vele [ankle] and right guard Cesar Ruiz [ankle] were lost to injuries during the game - and gutted out a victory that raised their record to 3-2 in the NFC South.

New Orleans battled uphill the entire game; it punted on its opening drive and Carolina followed with a 13-play, 74-yard touchdown drive to take a 7-0 lead. The Saints used their first possession of the second quarter to construct a 17-play, 95-yard touchdown drive that lasted 11:22 and ended on Neal's four-yard touchdown run, his second in as many weeks.

But the Panthers nudged ahead on a 40-yard field goal with 21 seconds left in the first half, then expanded the lead to 17-7 when quarterback Bryce Young threw a 32-yard touchdown pass to Jalen Coker with 9:54 left in the third.

Three consecutive possessions resulted in a fourth-down stop by New Orleans' defense, a fourth-down stop by Carolina's defense, and a forced punt by New Orleans before the frantic finish.

The game-tying drive began at the Saints' 22-yard line with 4:37 left, and Shough completed six of seven passes for 83 yards, including the 12-yard score to Olave with 2:29 left. He connected with Olave, who has game highs of six catches for 85 yards, four times for 63 yards on the drive.

Carolina drove from its 29 to its 43 on its final drive before stalling and punting, with the Saints beginning the game's final drive at their nine-yard line following a holding penalty on the punt return.

Shough completed three passes for 43 yards, spiked the ball to stop the clock with 12 seconds

left, then scrambled for four yards and drew a personal foul penalty because he was hit when he started his slide. The 15 yards pushed the Saints from Carolina's 44 to the 29, backup quarterback Spencer Rattler subbed in for the injured Shough to throw incomplete and sift three seconds off the clock to lower it to six seconds, and Smyth popped the winner on second-and-ten.

"It was huge," Shough said of the victory. "I felt like we had played well on the road but we wanted to show the fans what we could do here, just as a team collectively. Just the resiliency, just a lot of fun. We're just proud of everybody throughout the whole game, especially against a really good team. Two playoff teams, back to back. It was a lot of fun."

PHIL GALIANO

Phil Galiano is in his first season as the Saints' special teams coordinator and his seventh campaign in New Orleans, spending his first six years as the club's assistant special teams coach. Galiano is a veteran in the coaching ranks with 25 years of experience, including nine seasons in the NFL.

Galiano's work over the past six years with Darren Rizzi, who served as coordinator from 2019-24, helped make the kicking game an important key to victory for New Orleans. On coverage units, J.T. Gray's 93 tackles rank first in the NFL, with the special teams ace selected as an Associated Press All-Pro three times. The punting game has produced the top five seasons in club history for punts inside-the-20-yard line. Since 2019, the Saints have excelled in the return game. Over the six-season period, the team has been ranked fifth in the NFL in punt return average [10.4] and are tied for second in the league with three punts returned for touchdowns. The coverage units have allowed the third-lowest punt return average [7.0].

Special teams continued to be a bright spot for New Orleans in 2024, highlighted by Gray being selected as an All-Pro after recording an NFL-best 26 coverage tackles and one blocked punt. New Orleans ranked first in the NFL in opponent starting field position after kickoffs [28.2], punts inside-the-20 yard line [franchise-record 41], fifth in punt return average [12.5], seventh in opponent field goal percentage [78.6], eighth in opponent punt return average [7.6] and tenth in field goal percentage [87.1]. Two blocked field goals were crucial in a pair of three-point victories. K Blake Grupe made 27-of-31 field goal attempts, six-of-eight from 50+ yards, an 87.1 percentage and scored 112 points. WR/RS Rashid Shaheed returned a punt for a touchdown for the second consecutive season.

A three-year starter at safety for Shippensburg, Galiano served as a tri-captain during his senior campaign. He helped lead the Raiders to consecutive winning seasons [1997-99]. The Norristown, Pa. native graduated a degree in business administration.

OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR

DOUG NUSSMEIER

Doug Nussmeier is in his first season as the Saints' offensive coordinator and tenth campaign as a coach in the National Football League. A 24-year coaching veteran, Nussmeier returns to New Orleans after originally being a fourth round pick [116th overall] of the Saints in the 1994 NFL Draft out of Idaho.

Nussmeier joins the Saints after spending the 2024 season as quarterbacks coach of the Philadelphia Eagles under Saints Head Coach Kellen Moore, who served as offensive coordinator, where he proved to be a key piece of their Super Bowl LIX Champion offensive coaching staff. Jalen Hurts flourished under Nussmeier's tutelage, posting a career-high 103.7 passer rating, fifth in the league and tying for the fifth-most rushing touchdowns [14] in the league [first among quarterbacks].

Nussmeier rejoined the NFL with the Dallas Cowboys in 2018, after previously spending two seasons with the St. Louis Rams from 2006-07 as quarterbacks coach. After serving on the Cowboys staff from 2018-22, he served as quarterbacks coach of the Los Angeles Chargers in 2023. In between, he spent 13 seasons coaching at the collegiate level, where he tutored eight different players who were selected in the first or second round of the NFL Draft.

Nussmeier finished his career at the University of Idaho as the program's all-time leading passer with 10,824 career passing yards over five years [1989-93]. He won the Walter Payton Award in 1993, which was at the time given annually to the top player in NCAA Division 1-AA after throwing for a program-record 33 touchdown passes and leading the Vandals to a national semifinal berth. Nussmeier was named Big Sky Conference Offensive Player of the Year in 1992 and was inducted into the University of Idaho Athletic Hall of Fame in 2008.

A Portland, Ore. native, Nussmeier and his wife, Christi, have two sons, Garrett and Colton, and a daughter, Ashlynn. Garrett is in his fifth season as a quarterback at LSU.

COORDINATOR CORNER

DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR
BRANDON STALEY

Brandon Staley is in his first season as the Saints' defensive coordinator. Staley is a 19-year coaching veteran with three as head coach of the Los Angeles Chargers.

This will be Staley's second stint as a defensive coordinator after leading the Los Angeles Rams to finish first in the NFL in total defense in 2020.

Staley arrived in New Orleans after serving most recently as assistant coach/defense of the San Francisco 49ers in 2024. Working with multiple position groups, as well as aiding 49ers Head Coach Kyle Shanahan, the San Francisco defense finished the season ranked eighth in the NFL in opponent net yards per game (317.4) and fifth against the pass (192.8 ypg.). DL Nick Bosa was selected to the Pro Bowl after recording nine sacks, one interception, one forced fumble and one recovery. ILB Fred Warner was selected to the Pro Bowl, Associated Press All-Pro and PFWA All-NFL, as he registered 131 tackles (76 solo), two interceptions returned for 70 yards, including a 45-yard touchdown return and four forced fumbles. Saints CB Issac Yiadom led the team with a career-high three takeaways.

During his tenure as Chargers head coach, Staley led Los Angeles to a 24-24 record and guided the franchise to its first postseason appearance since the 2018 season. In his final season with the Chargers (2023), Staley helped QB Justin Herbert continue one of the best starts to a career in NFL history as no quarterback has more completions or passing yards over the first four seasons of a career than Herbert. Staley also saw WR Keenan Allen and LB Khalil Mack put together career seasons and earn themselves nods to the Pro Bowl Games roster. Before becoming an NFL coach, Staley spent 11 seasons coaching at the collegiate level. In 2016, Staley earned National Coordinator of the Year honors for Division III.

A native of Perry, Ohio, Staley played collegiately as a quarterback at the University of Dayton for four seasons (2001-04) before finishing at Division II Mercyhurst College in 2005. He and his wife Amy, have three sons, Colin, Will and Grant.

Joel Thomas, a 25-year coaching veteran, returns to New Orleans to tutor the clubs running backs in 2025. He previously spent nine years with the Black and Gold (2015-23). After spending the 2024 season coaching the New York Giants running backs, the Port Angeles, Wash. native returns to New Orleans with an additional title of associate head coach.

During Thomas' initial nine-year tenure in tutoring the Saints running backs, the Black and Gold tied for second in the NFL with 161 rushing touchdowns and his backs registered 25 individual 100-yard performances. Under his tutelage, Alvin Kamara, the Saints' all-time rushing yardage leader, earned five consecutive Pro Bowl selections (2017-21) and was the only NFL player with at least 1,160 total yards from scrimmage in each of the seven seasons he first coached him, three of them 1,500 or more.

In 2023 under Thomas, Kamara became the franchise's all-time leader in yards from scrimmage, rushing touchdowns and total touchdowns. Thomas also coached Mark Ingram II, New Orleans' all-time rushing leader from 2021-24 (6,500 yards), for six years, including two 1,000-yard campaigns. During Thomas' first New Orleans tenure, the Saints ranked in the top six in the NFL in rushing three times (2017, 2018 and 2020).

With the Giants in 2024, Thomas oversaw the development of rookie tailback Tyrone Tracy Jr., a fifth round pick. Tracy earned PFWA All-Rookie when he carried 192 times for 839 yards (4.4 avg.) with five TDs to rank second among NFL rookies for the season and New York rookies all-time in rushing yards. He added 38 receptions for 284 yards with one TD to tally 1,123 yards from scrimmage, the fifth-highest total among NFL rookies in 2024 and fourth among Giants rookies all-time.

Thomas lettered as a running back at Idaho from 1993-98 and still holds Vandals career records with 3,929 rushing yards and 51 touchdowns. He was inducted into the University of Idaho Athletic Hall of Fame in 2008. Thomas earned his degree in communications in 1998.

Thomas and his wife, Ebbie, have two boys, Teyo and Niko.

Haslett was an assistant for the Los Angeles Raiders, Saints, Pittsburgh Steelers, St. Louis Rams, Washington Redskins, Cincinnati Bengals and Tennessee Titans and was head coach of the Saints from 2000-05, where he guided the franchise to their first playoff victory in 2000 and was named NFL Coach of the Year.

Defensive Pass Game Coordinator Terry Joseph - Cousin Vance Joseph is currently defensive coordinator of the Denver Broncos, was their head coach from 2017-18 and has also been an assistant coach with six other teams, after also playing for the New York Jets and Indianapolis Colts. Senior VP/Asst. GM-College Personnel Jeff Ireland - Stepson of Chiefs Hall of Fame linebacker/center E.J. Holub. Grandson of Eagles running back and Bears personnel executive Jim Parmer.

BUCKING THE ODDS

The Saints have a long tradition of finding players as free agents signed after the draft that make an impact immediately or after developing their careers initially on the practice squad. Several undrafted Saints on the roster have played key roles on offense, defense and special teams.

Over the past 22 years, the Saints [2018-22: DB **J.T. Gray**, WR/RS **Deonte Harty** and WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed**] and San Diego/Los Angeles Chargers [2003: G **Kris Dielman**, TE **Antonio Gates** and WR **Kasim Osgood**] are the only two teams to have three players signed as undrafted free agents be selected to a Pro Bowl for the team that originally signed them.



Defensive End **Carl Granderson** joined the club in 2019 as an undrafted free agent out of the University of Wyoming and has appeared in 10 games with 47 starts, posting 283 tackles [168 solo], 33 sacks for a loss of 202.5 yards, eight pass breakups, four forced fumbles and two recoveries, one blocked field goal and one blocked extra point.

In 2025, Granderson has enjoyed a productive season, recording 43 tackles [29 solo], 4.5 sacks to rank third on the team and three pass breakups. In the first two games of the season, he recorded more than one sack. If Granderson leads the team in sacks in 2025, he would join linebacker Rickey Jackson, linebacker Pat Swilling, defensive lineman Wayne Martin, defensive tackle La'Roi Glover and defensive ends Will Smith and Cameron Jordan as Saints to lead the team in quarterback takedowns in consecutive seasons.

Granderson enjoyed a monster performance at Tampa Bay on December 7, when he finished with five tackles [four solo], including two stops for loss and one pass breakup.



Tight end **Juwan Johnson** first led Saints tight ends with four touchdown receptions in 2021, converting to the position that offseason after playing wideout in college and as a rookie in 2020, he signed as an undrafted free agent from Oregon. Johnson led Saints tight ends with a career-high 50 receptions for a club-best 548 yards in 2024, adding three touchdown grabs. He has led the Saints with 17 receiving touchdowns over the past four seasons, seventh over that period among NFL tight ends. In his career, Johnson has played in 81 games [41 starts], making 208 receptions for 2,266 yards with 21 TDs.

In 2025, Johnson is ranked seventh among tight ends in receiving yards and eighth in receiving with a career-high 62 grabs for a career-best 64 yards with three touchdowns. His 200 receptions as a tight end [four additional were as a WR in 2020] are fourth among the position all-time for the club, needing three grabs on Sunday to move into a tie for third.

Sixty-four-year-old **Isaiah Stalbird** signed with the New Orleans Saints in 2024. Signing following the 2024 NFL Draft, linebacker **Isaiah Stalbird** played at Nebraska (2019) and South Dakota State (2020-23). He played in 64 games and made 251 tackles, 18.5 for loss, three sacks, an interception, 19 pass breakups, five forced fumbles, two recoveries and three blocked punts for the 2022 and 2023 FCS National Champions. Through 14 games in 2025, Stalbird has a team-high 1 coverage stops and has added ten defensive tackles one sack and one pass breakup.

Sixty-four-year-old **Isaiah Stalbird** signed with the New Orleans Saints in 2024. Signing following the 2024 NFL Draft, linebacker **Isaiah Stalbird** played at Nebraska (2019) and South Dakota State (2020-23). He played in 64 games and made 251 tackles, 18.5 for loss, three sacks, an interception, 19 pass breakups, five forced fumbles, two recoveries and three blocked punts for the 2022 and 2023 FCS National Champions. Through 14 games in 2025, Stalbird has a team-high 1 coverage stops and has added ten defensive tackles one sack and one pass breakup.

Wide receiver **Mason Tipton** stuck on the 53-man roster in 2024 after showing bright spots in the preseason following a college career at Yale, where he posted 132 receptions for 1,067 yards with 19 touchdowns. In 2024, he had 14 receptions for 99 yards. In the 2025 preseason, Tipton led the team in all receiving categories with eight receptions for 158 yards (19.8 avg.) with one touchdown, ranking fifth in the league in receiving yardage. On Nov. 23, vs. Atlanta, Tipton brought back a kickoff for 75 yards, the longest by the team since the 2020 season. After returning the opening kickoff 54 yards to set up a touchdown on December 7 at Tampa Bay, he has brought back 12 kickoffs for 378 yards (31.5 avg.).

DRAFT RECAP

The New Orleans Saints 2025 draft class, the first under first-year Head Coach Kellen Moore features six-of-nine players currently contributing to the team's 53-man roster, three offensive players, as well as three defenders, with four (left tackle Kelvin Banks Jr., running back Devin Neal, safety Jonas Sanker and quarterback Tyler Shough) starting vs. Carolina on Sunday and CB Quincy Riley playing significant snaps. On offense, Executive Vice President/General Manager Mickey Loomis split the selections among four different positions.

Defensively, New Orleans added players at four different positions as the unit makes the switch to Defensive Coordinator Brandon Staley's 3-4 scheme, a safety, a linebacker and a cornerback currently contributing. With Riley recording a pick in Week Seven and Sanker posting one in Week Four, this is the first time since 2019, that two Saints rookie defenders have recorded interceptions.

Sunday's win over Carolina, was the time for the three offensive players to shine. While Banks continued to play a flawless left tackle, Neal rushed for a touchdown for the second consecutive week before suffering a hamstring injury. Shough was a standout, completing 24-of-34 passes (career-high 75.0 pct.) for 272 yards with one touchdown, zero interceptions and a 110.4 passer rating with a club-best 32 rushing yards. On defense, Sanker tied for the team lead with six tackles and Riley had three stops and a career-high two pass breakups, as the Saints surrendered only 154 net passing yards.

In the 17-7 win over Carolina on Nov. 9, DT Nathan Shepherd blocked a 48-yard field goal attempt, earning NFC Special Teams Player of the Week. FROM THE FIELD TO THE SIDELINE

Kellen Moore is the seventh New Orleans Saints head coach to have played in the National Football League, joining Tom Fears, John North, Dick Nolan, Mike Ditka, Jim Haslett and Sean Payton. Moore, who finished his college playing career at Boise State with a record of 50-3, the most wins by a quarterback in NCAA history, played six seasons for the Detroit Lions (2012-14) and Dallas Cowboys (2015-17).

BARKING UP THE RIGHT TREE

With Moore as his offensive coordinator in 2024 with the Eagles, Philadelphia running back Saquon Barkley had one of the best seasons by a tailback in NFL history. The consensus National Football League Offensive Player of the Year, a first-team Associated Press All-Pro and Pro Bowl starter selection, Barkley led the league with a franchise-record 2,005 rushing yards in the regular season, making him just the ninth player in NFL history to post 2,000+ rushing yards in a season, eight-most in league records. Including 499 rushing yards in the playoffs which ranked third all-time, Barkley's 2,504 rushing yards were the most in NFL single-season history (regular season and postseason combined).

NOTHING HURTS

In 2024 in Philadelphia, under the tutelage of Moore who served as offensive coordinator and Saints Offensive Coordinator Doug Nussmeier, who was quarterbacks coach, Eagles signal-caller Jalen Hurts was able to put together one of the best seasons of his career. The Super Bowl Most Valuable Player ranked among the top eight in the league in yards per attempt (fourth, 8.0), passer rating (fifth, career-high 103.7), completion percentage (eighth, career-high 6.7 pct.) and total touchdowns (32, eighth). In Super Bowl LIX, Hurts completed 17-of-22 passes (77.3 pct.) for 221 yards, two touchdowns, a 119.7 passer rating and 72 rushing yards with one touchdown on the ground, the most rushing yards by a signal-caller ever in a Super Bowl.

There are currently six Saints on the team's roster who have appeared in at least 100 regular season games for the franchise, led by DE Cameron Jordan with a franchise-record 2 regular season contests played. Only the second player to appear in 200 regular season games as a Saint, Jordan surpassed QB Drew Brees for first on Sept. 21 at Seattle and become the franchise's all-time leader. LS Zach Wood has not missed a game since joining the club in 2017.



FIVE STRAIGHT

In the Oct. 5 26-14 win over the New York Giants, the Saints recorded takeaways off five consecutive Giants possessions. This was the first time this occurred in an NFL game since the Kansas City Chiefs intercepted Jets QB Ryan Fitzpatrick on the last five Jets possessions of the contest in a 24-3 Chiefs win on Sept. 25, 2016. It was the first time the Saints had defensive takeaways on five consecutive possessions, since they had five straight interceptions in a 27-3 win at the Phoenix Cardinals on Dec. 22, 1991. Below is a summary of the turnovers in the last two Saints contests where the Black and Gold recorded five consecutive takeaways.

GOAL LINE STANDS

In the October 26 contest against the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, the Saints succeeded in a pair of short yardage situations against tall odds, putting the heart they have shown all season on full display in a valiant effort. In the second quarter, with the Buccaneers having first and one at the Saints' one-yard line, the New Orleans front seven stopped Buccaneers running back Rachaad White from entering the end zone on three straight plays, with defensive end Chris Rumph II and defensive tackle Nathan Shepherd stuffing Tampa Bay running back Sean Tucker on fourth-and-one.

In Tampa Bay's first drive of the third quarter, the Buccaneers advanced to the New Orleans one-yard line following a 22-yard completion from quarterback Baker Mayfield to tight end Cade Otton. On a pair of goal line plays, cornerback Kool-Aid McKinstry successfully defended Mayfield pass attempts to wideouts Sterling Shepard and Emeka Egbuka. On second down, linebacker Demario Davis stuffed Tucker.

Until Tucker reached the end zone on fourth and one, the Saints had successfully defended the one-yard line seven times in the contest, the first time a team had done so since the December 8, 2013 matchup where Tennessee Titans managed seven stops from the one-yard line by the Denver Broncos (credit-ESPN) at Empower Field at Mile High.

THIRD DOWN DEFENSE

In 2024, the the Saints finished ranked 21st in the NFL in opponent third down percentage [41.1], improving to ninth in the league [36.7].

DRAFT CONTRIBUTORS

The team's top three selections in the 2024 NFL Draft started multiple games for the Saints in 2024. Below is a summary of the performance of five of the top six 2024 draft picks, as each of them have made a jump in 2025:



Right Tackle Taliese Fuaga, Oregon State [D1] - Selected with the 14th overall pick out of Oregon State, the Saints were able to address an immediate need, while also acquiring a building block for the future. Fuaga was an anchor on the Saints offensive line in his rookie campaign, seamlessly moving over to the left tackle position for his first NFL season, where he opened every game for an offense that improved in every rushing metric. Starting all 17 games, he was the first Saint to start every game in his rookie year at the offensive line's most challenging position since J.T. Taylor in 1978. Now in 2025, Fuaga has moved back to his natural right tackle position. After missing the Week Three contest at Seattle, he returned to the lineup in Week Four and helped spur a run game that gained a season-high 189 yards. On October 5, against the New York Giants, he anchored an offensive line that kept QB Spencer Rattler's jersey clean and did not give up a sack.

Cornerback Kool-Aid McKinstry, Alabama [D2] - Selected in the second round of the 2024 NFL Draft with the 41st overall pick out of Alabama, McKinstry arrived in New Orleans having covered many of the nation's top wideouts in the Southeastern Conference for the last three years.

In 2023, the consensus first-team All-American was a semifinalist for the Jim Thorpe Award in his final campaign for the Crimson Tide, making 32 tackles and seven passes defensed.

In New Orleans, McKinstry played in 15 games with nine starts as a rookie in 2024, moving into the starting lineup in Week Eight and recorded 44 tackles with seven pass breakups, often tasked with covering an opponent's top wideout.

Through 14 contests/start in 2025, he has recorded 62 tackles (49 solo) with, three interceptions to tie for 15th in the NFL and a club-best ten pass breakups. The Pinson, Ala. native recorded the first two picks of his career in the October 5 win over the New York Giants, capturing NFC Defensive Player of the Week honors for the first time in his career. On Nov. 30 at the Miami Dolphins, McKinstry neutralized a prior New Orleans giveaway by recording an interception in the end zone and later got the Saints defense off the field with a fourth down stop. In the season series with Tampa Bay, McKinstry played an important role in surrendering only 124 and 122 total net yards in the contests. In 29 career games with 23 starts, he has career totals of 103 stops (80 solo), three picks, 17 pass breakups and one special teams tackle.

QB Spencer Rattler, South Carolina [D5a] - Selected with the team's first selection in the fifth round (150th overall) out of South Carolina, Rattler completed 900-of-1,313 passes (68.5 pct.) for 10,807 yards with 77 touchdowns, and only 32 interceptions for the Gamecocks (2022-23) and Oklahoma (2019-21).



As a rookie in 2024, Rattler appeared in seven games with six starts, he completed 130-of-228 passes for a Saints rookie-record 1,317 yards with four touchdowns, also carrying 18 times for 146 yards.

On the 2025 season in nine games with eight starts, Rattler has completed 173-of-257 passes (67.3 pct.) for 1,586 yards with eight touchdowns, five interceptions and an 86.8 passer rating. Rattler has also utilized his feet, carrying 31 times for 167 yards (5.4 avg.).

LB Jaylan Ford, Texas [D5c] - The last of three fifth round draft picks by the club in 2024, Ford was selected out of the University of Texas, where during he posted 287 tackles, 27.5 stops for loss, three sacks, ten pass breakups, six interceptions, four forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries. As a rookie, Ford established a role on special teams, contributing five tackles before suffering a fibula injury in Week 17. Ford has comprised his role as a core special teams player in 2025, making eight stops after recording one on Sunday vs. Carolina.



DT Khristian Boyd, Northern Iowa [D6] - A sixth round selection, Boyd appeared in 49 career games in college and collected 149 tackles (59 solo), 22.5 stops for loss, 10.5 sacks, five pass breakups and two forced fumbles.



In his final college season, Boyd started all 11 games along and had 43 stops, 6.5 tackles for loss, 3.5 sacks and a pass breakup, while earning All-MVFC first-team and consensus FCS third-team All-American. Following a full offseason, and utilizing his 6-2, 320-pound frame to fit into the Saints' 3-4 alignment, the Kansas City native led the Black and Gold with two sacks in the preseason, providing a push up the team's interior defensive line. Boyd has three stops in two games

JETS VS. SAINTS

LINING THEM UP



One of New Orleans Head Coach Kellen Moore's first tasks was shoring up the alignment and the overall depth of the Saints offensive line- a unit that saw nine different starting combinations during the 2024 campaign. The line has gelled, now managing a season-long absence of Pro Bowl center Erik McCoy, who suffered a biceps injury in Week Seven, despite, the offensive line staff being forced to employ six different starting combinations.

A franchise that has consistently invested in the offensive line with four first round picks in the last six seasons, the past two campaigns have been no different. On the interior right guard **Cesar Ruiz** is the elder statesman, having been selected in the first round in 2020, having played in 88 regular season contests with 82 starts. In 2025, Ruiz has opened 13-of-14 contests, returning after missing only one game from a high ankle sprain suffered in Week Four.



In the last two seasons, New Orleans has continued to fortify their offensive line, selecting left tackle **Kelvin Banks Jr.** (ninth overall-2025) out of the University of Texas and right tackle **Taliese Fuaga** (14th overall-2024) out of Washington State University.

Banks, 6-5, 315, was selected with the ninth overall pick out of Texas this past April, the highest selection by the Black and Gold since 2005. A three-year starter who opened all 42 games he played in at left tackle for the Longhorns from 2022-24, Banks was the 2024 Outland Trophy winner and a unanimous All-American selection. In his first season, Banks has lined up at the position that he manned flawlessly as a college standout, facing weekly challenges from some of the NFL's elite pass rushers, a leading candidate for league All-Rookie honors, the only Saints offensive lineman to open every contest.

2024 first round pick Fuaga, immediately moved into left tackle as a rookie after being a two-year starter at right tackle at Oregon State, earning first-team All-American in 2023.

In 2025, the Tacoma, Wash. native became the first Saints rookie to start every game at the position since J.T. Taylor in 1978. In 2025 for his second-team campaign, Fuaga has moved back to the right tackle position he manned in Corvallis, fighting ankle, back and knee injuries to open ten contests.



Luke Fortner is a former University of Kentucky standout who was a third round pick (65th overall) of the Jacksonville Jaguars out of Kentucky in 2022 and has started 41 of the 65 regular season games he has played and two postseason contests in 2023. Acquired by New Orleans in a preseason trade with the Jaguars following an exhibition game by the two clubs, Fortner has been called into action to manage the center position for the Black and Gold for the remainder of the 2025 campaign.

Following the trade of left guard Trevor Penning on November 4, the offensive line is rounded out by OL Asim Richards, who has seen action at right tackle in the absence of Fuaga, including opening three contests. G/T Dillon Radunz, who started the first two contests at left guard, takes over the position following the trade of Trevor Penning. Rookie C/G Torricelli Simpkins II started one game at right guard and one contest at center. T/G Xavier Truss, a rookie from the University of Georgia, was awarded off waivers from Denver at the end of the preseason and provides valuable depth, while developing.

SPECIAL TEAMS OVERVIEW

Saints special teams will benefit from the elevation of Phil Galiano to coordinator, after serving as assistant special teams coach for the past five-and-a-half seasons before taking over coordination of the unit midway through the 2024 season. During Galiano's tenure, the special teams units have consistently ranked among the NFL's leaders in placekicking, coverage and return units, producing Pro Bowlers and AP All-Pros, also setting various club records in placekicking, punting, return game and coverage units. Under Galiano's direction, the club has committed to a transition of a mix of seasoned veterans and several promising youngsters.



BLOCK UNIT

New Orleans' field goal block unit came through big on three occasions in the second half of the 2024 season, two taking place in three-point victories. The field goal block unit's hard work carried over into the 2025 season opener, as third-year defensive tackle **Bryan Bresee** blocked a fourth quarter 46-yard field goal attempt to give the offense the ball back for a drive where they ended up scoring a field goal.



In the third quarter of New Orleans' November 9, at Carolina, narrowly holding onto a 10-7 third quarter lead, DT **Nathan Shepherd** blocked a 48-yard field goal attempt. For his efforts, Shepherd was named the Week Ten NFC Special Teams Player of the Week.

New Orleans leads the NFL since the 2024 season with four blocked field goals.

COVERAGE UNITS

Galiano and Assistant Special Teams Coach Kyle Wilber have been tasked with remaking the coverage aspect of the special teams units with the top Six tacklers from the 2024 campaign not on the roster. LB Isaiah Stalbird leads the team with 14 stops through 14 games.

This second-year wideout, who never returned a kick until his rookie season in 2024, has assumed both of his kickoff return duties with success for New Orleans, using his combination of straight-ahead speed and ability to find creases and work with blocks. Tipton to help carry the Black and Gold to a 20-17 victory. (75 yards vs. Atlanta, 11/23 and 54 yards at Tampa Bay, Dec. 7) joined Tennessee's Chimere Dike (71 yards against Denver, Sept. 7 and 65 yards against Arizona, Oct. 5) as only the second player in 2025 season opener at Atlanta in a 27-26 Saints victory. with two kickoff returns of at least 54 yards.

GAME WINNER

K CHARLIE SMYTH

Signed by New Orleans in the 2024 offseason as part of the NFL's International Player Pathway program, this Newry, Ireland native spent his entire rookie campaign and the first 12 weeks of 2025 on the practice squad. The former Gaelic football player made his NFL debut on Nov. 30 at Miami and successfully executed an onside kick recovered by 7.75% success rate since new league kickoff rules being instituted in 2018.



Smyth's 56-yard field goal was tied for the second-longest field goal by an NFL player on their first career attempt.



On Sunday vs. Carolina, Smyth made both of his PAT attempts, a 42-yard field goal and a 47-yard game-winning field goal with two seconds remaining to help carry the Black and Gold to a 20-17 victory. Smyth's kick was the first game-winner (within two minutes of end of regulation or in overtime) by the yards against Denver, Sept. 7 and 65 yards against Saints since a 51-yard kick by Wil Lutz in the 2022 Arizona, Oct. 5) as only the second player in 2025 season opener at Atlanta in a 27-26 Saints victory.

QUARTERBACKS

TYLER SHOUGH

With their eyes on competition and development, the Saints selected Tyler Shough (pronounced Shuck) out of Louisville with the team's selection in the second round (40th overall) of the 2025 NFL Draft. In seven seasons at Oregon (2018-20), Texas Tech In seven seasons at Oregon (2018-20), Texas Tech player made his NFL debut on Nov. 30 at Miami and (2021-23) and Louisville (2024), Shough played in 42 games and completed 599-of-951 passes (63.0 pct.) games and completed 599-of-951 passes (63.0 pct.) successfully executed an onside kick recovered by for 7,820 yards with 59 touchdowns, also carrying teammate Devaughn Vele, part of a play that has a 246 times for 733 yards with 11 scores.



In eight games with six starts, Shough has completed 144-of-216 passes (67.7 pct.) for 1,484 yards with six touchdowns, five interceptions and an 85.9 passer rating, also carrying 36 times for 138 yards with two touchdowns and an additional two-point conversion rush. In the clutch, Shough has become the first Saint since 2020 to lead the Black and Gold to two straight fourth quarter game-winning drives, the first Saint to do so since 2000, including leading the team from a 17-10 fourth quarter deficit in Sunday's 2017 victory over Carolina. Shough leads NFL rookies in completion percentage.

In his second career start at Carolina on Nov. 9, he completed 19-of-27 passes for Saints rookie-record 282 yards with two touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 128.9 passer rating. His first touchdown pass was a 62-yard laser to WR Chris Olave, which was the second-longest touchdown thrown by a Saints rookie quarterback, with Archie Manning throwing a 63-yarder to WR Danny Abramowicz on October 3, 1971 against the Houston Oilers.

With the victory, Shough became the first Saints rookie signal-caller to win a start since Dave Wilson [at L.A. Rams, 11/8/81]. Overall he became the fourth Saints rookie to win a start, joining Wilson, Manning [1971] and Larry Cipa.

The last time a Saints quarterback had 2+ touchdown passes and zero interceptions in one of his first two career starts was Manning [9/26/71 @ San Francisco].

RUN FOR IT

In the December 7, 24-20 win at Tampa Bay, Shough achieved several firsts in using both his arm and legs to help power New Orleans' 24-20 win over the Buccaneers. Shough completed 13-of-20 passes (65.0 pct.) for 144 yards, with a career day on the ground in driving rain, carrying seven times for 55 yards with two touchdowns. Shough's two scores were the first time a Saints rookie had two rushing TDs since Archie Manning [vs. Dallas on 10/17/71] and his 55 yards rushing are the most in franchise history by a rookie signal-caller. Shough executed the first fourth quarter game winning drive of his career, when with the score tied 17-17, he drove New Orleans down the field 53-yards on nine plays, ending with a 13-yard rushing TD. In addition to the rushing touchdown, Shough completed three-of-four passes for 36 yards on the game-winning drive.

GAME-WINNERS

On Sunday vs. Carolina Shough engineered an eight-play, 62-yard drive that took 55 seconds, ending with a 47-yard field goal by K Charlie Smyth. In it, he completed three-of-four passes for 43 yards and also gained four yards on a rush to help lead the Saints to the 20-17 win. In the fourth quarter alone, Shough completed 13-of-18 passes for 162 yards with the game-tying 12-yard touchdown pass to WR Chris Olave, as well as grinding out four yards rushing, for the second-highest fourth quarter passing yardage total in Week 15 in the NFL.

JETS VS. SAINTS

With Shough's fourth quarter game-winning drive at Tampa Bay the prior week, it is the first time a Saints signal-caller has had fourth quarter/over-time game-winning drives in consecutive contests since Drew Brees in Weeks Five (team had bye in Week Six), Seven and Eight of the 2020 season. Shough and Jayden Daniels (2024) are the only rookie quarterbacks in the last ten seasons to lead a game-winning drive in back-to-back games against a team with a winning record.



TAYSON HILL

Hill has brought unheralded versatility to the Saints offense and special teams. He's played in 115 games with 51 starts at several positions. He has carried 474 times for 2,50 yards, the most by a Saint not to play running back full-time, with 34 touchdowns, ranked fifth in club records. In the passing game, he has caught 103 passes for 966 yards with 11 touchdowns, completed 194-of-307 passes for 2,388 yards with 11 touchdowns, returned 20 kicks for 489 yards, made one defensive tackle, a forced fumble, 16 special teams tackles and blocked one punt.

After suffering a season-ending knee injury in Week 13 of the 2024 season, Hill aggressively rehabbed to return to action in Week Four. On Oct. 12, vs. the New England Patriots, Hill scored his first rushing touchdown of the season on a one-yard run. He has rushed for 70 yards with one touchdown, caught four passes for 23 yards, completed one pass for 19 yards and had his first special teams stop of the season on December 7 at Tampa Bay. Hill was voted by his teammates as the 2025 Ed Block Courage Award Saints team winner.



BY THE NUMBERS

ALVIN KAMARA



A talented runner and receiver who was selected by the Saints in the third round of the 2017 NFL Draft out of Tennessee, Alvin Kamara In 126 career games with 95 starts, has carried 1,675 times for 7,250 yards [4.3 avg.] with 61 touchdowns and has caught 606 passes [ranked sixth all-time among running backs] for 4,948 yards [8.2 avg.] with 25 touchdowns. Kamara is the franchise's all-time leader in rushing yards, rushing touchdowns, total touchdowns [87], two-point conversions [7], total yards from scrimmage [12,198], all-purpose yardage [12,862] and first downs [601].

In 2025, Kamara leads the team in rushing with 471 yards with one touchdown and has caught 33 passes for 186 yards for 657 total yards from scrimmage.

Since entering the NFL in 2017, Saints running back Kamara ranks third in the league in yards from scrimmage [12,198], only one of three to have 12,000 over that period. With 1,493 scrimmage yards in 2024, Kamara is the third player since 2000 with at least 1,100 scrimmage yards in each of his first eight seasons, joining Matt Forte and Pro Football Hall of Famer LaDainian Tomlinson.



Kamara posted double-digit reception performances in the same season for the first time in his NFL career in 2023, with 13 grabs vs. Tampa Bay, Oct. 1 and 12 catches vs. Jacksonville, Oct. 29. His seven career games of ten or more catches is tied for second in NFL history among running backs.

DEVIN NEAL

The team's sixth round draft pick out of Kansas, Neal put together an impressive college career that included three consecutive 1,000-yard seasons as he finished as the Jayhawks' all-time leading roster. Neal played in 50 games for the Jayhawks, rushing 760 times for 4,343 yards [5.7 avg.] with 49 touchdowns and had 77 catches for 711 yards with four touchdowns. In addition to being the school's all-time leading rusher, he also holds the KU school record for rushing touchdowns [49], scrimmage touchdowns [53] and 100+ yard rushing games [20].

Neal was selected by the Black and Gold on the strength of his final campaign in Lawrence, where he was an honorable mention All-Big 12 selection, rushing for 1,266 yards on 219 attempts [5.8 avg.] and 16 touchdowns, while catching 24 passes for 254 yards with one touchdown.

After competing for carries in the preseason, Neal has emerged as New Orleans' top backup behind Kamara, appearing in ten games with three starts and rushing for 206 yards and catching 17 passes for 104 yards. In his second career start on December 7 at Tampa Bay, Neal rushed for 70 yards, with his first career touchdown in the fourth quarter and added to his total with a 14-yard reception on third down in the second half to keep a drive alive. In Sunday's win over Carolina, before departing with a hamstring injury, Neal scored a rushing touchdown for the second consecutive week.

AUDRIC ESTIME

A fifth round selection of the Denver Broncos in 2024 out of Notre Dame, where he carried 210 times for 1,341 yards [6.4 avg.] with 18 touchdowns in 2023, the New Jersey native played in 13 games with one start as a rookie and carried 76 times for 310 yards [4.1 avg.] with two touchdowns. After spending the start of the 2025 season on the Eagles practice squad, Estime joined the Saints practice roster in late October and was signed to the active roster in Week 11. In four games, Estime has rushed for 22 yards. In the passing game in Sunday's win over Carolina, he made a big impact, catching three passes for 39 yards, two on the Saints game-winning drive with Kamara and Neal not available due to injuries.



WIDE RECEIVERS

CHRIS OLAVE

The 11th overall pick in the 2022 NFL Draft out of Ohio State, this talented wideout made an immediate impact as a rookie, catching 72 passes for 1,042 yards [14.5 avg.] and four TDs, leading the team in receptions, receiving average and receiving yards, while earning September NFL Offensive Rookie of the Month honors as the 24th player since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger to record 1,000 receiving yards as a rookie. Olave became the third Saints rookie to reach 1,000 receiving yards and the first Saints rookie since WR Danny Abramowicz [1967] to lead the team in receiving, receiving yardage and yards per catch in his first campaign.

In 2023, Olave took the next step in his promising-career, leading the team in receiving and receiving yardage for the second consecutive season with 87 receptions for 1,123 yards and five TDs, tying for the team lead. He became the seventh Saint with 85 receptions in a season and the sixth with 1,100 receiving yards in a season.

In 2024, prior to being placed on Injured Reserve in Week Ten [concussion], he led the team's wideout corps in receiving with 32 grabs for a club-best 400 yards with one touchdown in eight games. Olave has rebounded to appear in every contest, while leading the team in receiving in 2025 with 82 receptions for 896 yards with a career-high six touchdowns, tying a career-high in scoring grabs, after a standout Sunday vs. Carolina, when he had six catches for 85 yards with a 12-yard touchdown.

JETS VS. SAINTS

Olave is ranked seventh in the NFL in receiving, 11th in receiving yards and tied for fourth in third down receptions (23) after his third down 12-yard scoring grab in the fourth quarter of Sunday's victory.

THIRD THROUGH 50

Olave's 260 receptions through his first 50 games is ranked third among Saints. Overall his career totals in 51 games with 40 starts at 264 grabs for 3,346 yards and 15 touchdowns.

Olave's only third down grab of Sunday's win over Carolina came at a clutch moment, a fourth quarter 12-yard touchdown reception to tie the score at 17-17. It was Olave's fourth touchdown grab on third down of 2025, as he is tied for third in the statistical category.

DEVAUGHN VELE

This second-year wideout was acquired by the Saints from the Denver Broncos near the conclusion of the preseason. A seventh round pick of Denver out of Utah in 2024, Vele appeared in 13 games with seven starts, recording 41 receptions for 475 yards with three touchdowns, tallying the most receiving yards, receptions and receiving touchdowns by a Broncos' seventh-round draft choice as a rookie. The Saints will look to utilize the San Diego native's 6-5, 210 frame in key spots. In 2025, he has made 25 catches for 293 yards with two touchdowns, 19 grabs in the last four contests.

TIGHT ENDS**JUWAN JOHNSON**

The former Penn State and Oregon wideout joined the New Orleans Saints in 2020 following the NFL Draft and transitioned to tight end his second season in 2021. Overall, Johnson's 18 touchdown grabs since 2021 lead the team. In 2024, Johnson stepped up after missing most of training camp with a foot injury to play in all 17 games with five starts and make a career-high 50 receptions for a team-best/career-best 548 yards. With a career-high 62 receptions for a career-best 644 yards with three touchdowns in 2025, Johnson joined Jimmy Graham and Benjamin Watson as the third Saints tight end with 60 grabs in a season.

BREAKOUT PERFORMANCE

Vele enjoyed a breakout performance on Nov. 30, at Miami, when he caught a career-high eight passes for 93 yards with one touchdown, also recovering an onside kick late in the fourth quarter. Vele caught all eight passes targeted to him.

**KEVIN AUSTIN JR.**

A three-year letterman at Notre Dame, Kevin Austin Jr. played in 26 games with 13 starts and finished his college career with 54 receptions for 996 yards [18.4 avg.] with seven touchdowns. He enjoyed his most productive season as a senior in 2021, when he started all 13 games he played in and recorded 48 receptions for 888 yards [18.5 avg.] with seven touchdowns, earning first-team Phil Steele All-Independent honors.

Recording 11 receptions for 151 yards [13.7 avg.] in eight games in 2024, Austin stepped up in Sunday's win over Carolina after an injury to Vele, recording three receptions for 33 yards.

FOSTER MOREAU

This veteran tight end and New Orleans native who was a standout at Jesuit High School and Louisiana State University signed with the Saints in the 2023 offseason. He finished his fifth National Football League season and first with the Black and Gold after spending his first four campaigns with the Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders, who originally selected him in the fourth round of the 2019 NFL Draft. In his career, Moreau has contributed both as a pass catcher and blocker, appearing in 103 regular season games with 69 starts and has recorded 150 receptions for 1,767 yards (11.8 avg.) with 18 touchdowns, also adding seven special teams tackles. Moreau returned to action in Week Five after suffering a significant knee injury in the 2024 season finale. He has played in ten games with eight starts, posting six catches.



Jordan is now one of only 15 National Football League players to have at least 15 sacks against two opponents, 17 against the Tampa Bay Buccaneers and 25 against the Atlanta Falcons, both NFC South divisional rivals. Jordan's 23 takedowns of former Atlanta QB Matt Ryan are the most sacks a player has had against an individual quarterback in NFL history.



DT BRYAN BRESEE

The team's first round selection in 2023 out of Clemson after being a three-time All-ACC selection, the Maryland native played in 26 games with 21 starts for the Tigers, producing 54 tackles (35 solo), 15 stops for loss, nine sacks, a forced fumble, an interception and five passes defensed.

Bresee immediately found a role in New Orleans' interior rotation and appeared in all 17 games, recording 24 tackles, 4.5 sacks and six pass breakups. His sack total was the highest by a Saints rookie defensive tackle since becoming an official statistic (1982) and his pass defense total was the most in club records for a rookie at the position since the statistic was first recorded (1980). He was also tied for second in the league among defensive tackles.



Bresee enjoyed a breakout sophomore campaign, playing in all 17 games and tied for fourth in the NFL among defensive tackles with a career-high and team-leading 7.5 sacks. The 7.5 takedowns are the ninth-highest total in a single-season for a Saints defensive tackle and tied for fourth in the league at the position.

In the Oct. 5 win over the Giants, DB Jordan Howden picked up a fumble forced by Bresee and returned it 86 yards for a touchdown. In 2025, Bresee has 36 tackles (14 solo), 2.5 sacks, three passes defensed, one forced fumble and one blocked field goal, playing under a new defensive structure under coordinator Brandon Staley.

DT DAVON GODCHAUX

Davon Godchaux (pronounced duh-VAHN GOD-chaw) returned to his home state to play for New Orleans in his ninth NFL campaign after being acquired from New England. Originally a fifth round draft pick (178th overall) of the Miami Dolphins out of LSU in 2017, Godchaux has started 122-of-134 regular season games for the Dolphins (2017-20), Patriots (2021-24) and Saints (2025-), recording 470 tackles (219 solo), 5.5 sacks, 20 stops for loss, three pass breakups, three forced fumbles and one fumble recovery, as well as a solo stop in the 2021 Wild Card Playoff for New England. Godchaux is one of only four defensive tackles to have at least 55 total tackles in each of the past four seasons (2021-2024), along with DeForest Buckner (Indianapolis) and Zach Sieler and Christian Wilkins (Miami).

In 2024, he started all 17 games and posted 67 tackles (24 solo), one pass defensed and one stop for loss. In 2025, he's opened every contest and recorded 41 tackles (14 solo) and one forced fumble.

DE CARL GRANDERSON

Signed by New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Wyoming in 2019, Granderson posted 17.5 sacks in college and possesses the prototypical frame for an NFL pass rusher. Granderson has become a significant cog in the team's defensive line rotation with 283 tackles (168 solo), 33 sacks, eight pass breakups, four forced fumbles and two recoveries in 102 games.

JETS VS. SAINTS

Earning the starting right defensive end position in 2023, Granderson posted a career-high 78 tackles (44 solo), led the team with a career-best 8.5 sacks for a 55-yard loss, one pass defense, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery. Starting all 17 games in 2024, Granderson had 61 tackles, 5.5 sacks, tied for second on the team with Chase Young, a career-high four passes defensed, one forced fumble and a blocked extra point. Through the first 14 games of the 2025 season, he is third on the team with 4.5 sacks.

DE CHASE YOUNG

Originally selected by Washington with the second overall pick in the 2020 NFL Draft out of Ohio State, this talented edge rusher enters his sixth season and second in New Orleans. In six campaigns for Washington (2020-23), San Francisco (2023) and New Orleans (2024), he's has appeared in 69 games with 41 starts and recorded 157 tackles (120 solo), 28 sacks, 35 stops for loss, 15 pass breakups, eight forced fumbles and four recoveries. The consensus NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year, Young recorded 7.5 sacks and made multiple splash plays with four forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries in 2020. In 2023, he played in seven games for Washington and nine for San Francisco following a midseason trade and tied his career-best with 7.5 takedowns in helping the 49ers advance to Super Bowl LVIII.

In 2025 after missing the first five games with a calf injury, Young has started/played in the last nine contests, posting 26 tackles (15 solo), six sacks to rank second on the team, seven stops for loss, three passes defensed, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery.

Young had at least one split-sack, a total of three, in three straight contests for the first time in his career, including a takedown of Rams QB Matthew Stafford at Los Angeles on Nov. 2.

In New Orleans' Week 12 matchup against Atlanta, Young dropped Falcons signal-caller Kirk Cousins for his fourth sack in six games.



On Sunday vs. Carolina, Young had a crucial fourth quarter sack on first down in the Saints win.

DE CHRIS RUMPH II

Signed as a free agent in the offseason, Rumph is well-versed in defensive coordinator Brandon Staley's system. In his career, he's played in 51 games and made 59 tackles (35 solo), four sacks, two passes defensed, one forced fumble, one fumble recovery and 22 special teams tackles, posting a career-best 12 coverage stops in 2025.

DT NATHAN SHEPHERD

Originally selected by the New York Jets in the third round of the 2018 NFL Draft out of Fort Hays State, this versatile defensive tackle enters his eighth NFL season, his third campaign with the Saints. The Ajax, Ontario, Canada native has appeared in 120 career games with 49 starts, totaling 239 tackles (121 solo) and 12.5 sacks for a loss of 107.5 yards. In 2025, he has started in seven-of-14 appearances and has 41 stops (19 solo) with two sacks and a blocked field goal..

LINEBACKERS

DEMARIO DAVIS

This dependable and sure-tackling defender joined the Saints in 2018 after spending his first six National Football League seasons with the New York Jets and Cleveland Browns. In his career, the Brandon, Miss. native has appeared in 224 regular season games with 210 starts for the Jets (2012-15, 2017), Browns (2016) and the Saints (2018-), recording 1,594 stops (989 solo), 44.5 sacks, four interceptions, 64 pass breakups, six forced fumbles and nine fumble recoveries.

Through 14 games, Davis is the team leader with 123 tackles (60 solo), including five stops for loss, two pass breakups, a team-leading two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. Davis is tied for eighth in the NFL in total tackles (press box statistics)

PETE WERNER

New Orleans selected this three-year starter from Ohio State in the second round of the 2021 NFL Draft. The Indianapolis native finished his college career playing in 47 career games with 35 starts, recording 185 tackles (111 solo), 16 stops for loss, four sacks, 11 pass breakups, four forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Werner helped power the Buckeyes to the College Football Playoff championship game as a senior in 2020, when he was voted by the Big Ten coaches as a first-team All-Conference selection and a Butkus Award semi-finalist, posting 54 tackles, 2.5 stops for loss, one sack and two forced fumbles.

In five seasons, Werner has played in 70 games with 62 starts and has recorded 395 tackles (249 solo), 2.5 sacks, one interception, ten pass breakups, two forced fumbles, five fumble recoveries and four special teams stops.

In 13 games started/played in 2024, Werner posted 92 tackles (54 solo) and one pass defense. In the 2025 season opener vs. Arizona, making his season debut in the team's new alignment, Werner tied for the team lead with nine tackles, including one sack. In 14 games/starts in 2025, he has 72 stops (45 solo), two sacks, a career-high five pass breakups and three fumble recoveries to lead the National Football League.

SECONDARY**S JUSTIN REID**

This versatile, hard-hitting, playmaking safety and South Louisiana native returned to his home state after signing with the Black and Gold during the 2025 offseason as an unrestricted free agent. Reid was originally selected by the Houston Texans in the third round (68th overall) in the 2018 NFL Draft out of Stanford. In seven NFL seasons, the former Dutchtown High School standout has played in 118 career regular season games with 114 starts for the Texans (2018-21), Kansas City Chiefs (2022-24) and Saints (2025-), recording 626 tackles (446 solo), 24 stops for a loss, 6.5 sacks, 11 interceptions, with two returned for touchdowns, 50 pass breakups, three forced fumbles, three fumble recoveries, 15 special teams stops and one blocked kick.

Reid has started all 12 games, he's played in and has 60 tackles, a split sack, a 49-yard interception return for a touchdown and four pass breakups.

CB ALONTAE TAYLOR

Selected by the Saints in the second round (49th overall) of the 2022 NFL Draft out of Tennessee, Taylor shook off early injuries to play in 13 games with nine starts and posted 45 tackles (38 solo) and a club-best 11 pass breakups, ranked fourth among NFL rookies.

Moving to the nickel position in 2023, possessing extensive experience on the inside and the outside, Taylor appeared in all 17 games with 13 starts and recorded 75 tackles, his first two career interceptions and a career-high 14 pass breakups, tied for second on the team and ninth in the NFL.

In 2024, Taylor played in all 17 games with 15 starts and ranked third on the team with a career-high 89 tackles (61 solo), was tied for fourth with four sacks and has added a club-best 16 passes defensed and two forced fumbles to tie for the team best. His four sacks were tied for the most by a Saints cornerback with Alex Molden. His pass defense total was ranked fifth in the National Football League.

GET A HAND ON

Taylor's 16 pass breakups in 2024 were tied for third in the NFC and fifth in the NFL. His 48 since coming into the league in 2022 are tied for fifth.

DB DROP

In the Sept. 8, 2024 season-opening win over Carolina, Taylor became the first Saints defensive back to record three sacks in a contest since the statistic was officially recognized by the NFL in 1982. The only other defensive back to record three sacks on kickoff weekend is former Chargers S Rodney Harrison (vs. Buffalo, 9/6/98). After splitting a sack on October 27 at the Los Angeles Chargers, Taylor's four sacks are tied for the highest total by a cornerback in Saints record books with Alex Molden's four in 1997, while the total ranked third among defensive backs and led all cornerbacks. Taylor's six career takedowns are tied with Molden for the most by a Saints cornerback all-time.

His 282 passing yards were also the most by a Saints rookie in a game, which passed Wilson as well. The last time a Saints quarterback had 2+ TD passes and 0 INTs in one of his first two career starts was Manning on Sept. 26, 1971, vs. San Francisco. No Saints QB has ever recorded 282+ passing yards, 2+ passing TDs and 0 INTs on the road in one of their first two starts. He and Head Coach Kellen Moore became the first rookie quarterback and first-year coach duo to win a game in franchise history. **vs. Atlanta (11/23):** Started. Finished 30-for-43 (69.8 pct.) for 243 yards, an interception and a 74.1 passer rating. Carried seven times for 22 yards (career-high). **at Miami (11/30):** Started. Finished 26-for-38 (65.8 pct.) for 239 yards, two touchdowns, one interception and a 91.9 passer rating. Rushed six times for 18 yards. Also rushed for a successful two-point conversion attempt and intercepted on a two-point conversion attempt. **at Tampa Bay (12/7):** Started and finished 13-of-20 (65.0 pct.) for 144 yards, one interception and a 65.4 passer rating. Had a career day on the ground, carrying seven times (tied career-high) for 55 yards and two touchdowns, with his longest rush being a 34-yard touchdown (all new career-highs). Shough's two scores were the first time a Saints rookie QB had two rushing TDs since Archie Manning (vs. Dallas on 10/17/71) and his 55 yards rushing are the most in franchise history by a rookie QB. Shough executed the first fourth quarter game-winning drive of his career, when with the score tied 17-17, he drove New Orleans down the field 53 yards on nine plays, ending with a 13-yard rushing TD. In addition to the rushing touchdown, Shough completed three-of-four passes for 36 yards on the game-winning drive. **vs. Carolina (12/14):** Started and finished 24-for-32 (75.0 pct., a career-best) for 272 yards with one touchdown pass, a 110.4 QB rating, and rushed eight times for 32 yards. With his 272 passing yards against the Panthers, Shough now has 1,484 passing yards in 2025, setting a new Saints' rookie single season rookie passing record, surpassing Spencer Rattler's previous franchise high of 1,317. His 12-yard touchdown pass in the fourth quarter to Chris Olave put Shough at six TD passes in 2025, tying Archie Manning's rookie-best mark of six, set in 1971. With the win today against the Panthers, Shough is the first Saints rookie QB to ever win a start in the Caesars Superdome and the first to win back-to-back games. He is also now 3-1 against the NFC South since becoming the starter. Shough engineered an eight-play, 62-yard game-winning drive that took 55 seconds, ending with a 47-yard field goal by K Charlie Smyth. In it, he completed three-of-four passes for 43 yards and also gained four yards on one scramble. With Shough's fourth quarter game-winning drives in back-to-back weeks, it is the first time a Saints signal-caller has had fourth quarter/overtime game-winning drives in consecutive contests since Drew Brees in Weeks Five (team had bye in Week Six), Seven and Eight of the 2020 season.

- The New Orleans Saints were victorious against the Carolina Panthers, 20-17, to improve to 4-10 on the season and to complete the series sweep against Carolina. Next up, the Saints face the New York Jets at the Caesars Superdome for a 12 p.m. CT kickoff. The game will be regionally televised on CBS (locally on WWL 4).
- The Saints victory improved New Orleans' overall record (regular + post season) to 34-29 against the Panthers and improved the team's divisional record to 3-2 on the season. The Saints became the first NFC South team with three division wins this season, with the season finale at Atlanta remaining in Week 18.
- The Black and Gold victory over the Panthers gave the Saints a 17-14 edge in games played in New Orleans.
- The victory was the 200th regular season victory by the team at the Caesars Superdome.
- In the second quarter, the Saints went on a 11-play, 95-yard drive that lasted 11 minutes and 22 seconds, capped off by a RB **Devin Neal** four yard rushing touchdown. It was the longest touchdown drive of the season for the club.
- It was the longest drive since an eight-play, 98-yard drive that ended with an eight yard touchdown run by RB **Kendre Miller** at the New York Giants, 12/8/24.
- QB **Tyler Shough** went 24-for-32 for 272 yards with a touchdown pass, zero interceptions and a 110.4 passer rating. He also rushed 8 times for 32 yards. With his 272 passing yards today to increase his season yardage total to 1,484, Shough broke the Saints' rookie single-season passing record of 1,317, set last year by Spencer Ratter.
- Shough engineered an eight-play, 62-yard drive that took 55 seconds, ending with a 47-yard field goal by K **Charlie Smyth**. In it, he completed three-of-four passes for 43 yards and also gained four yards on a rush. With Shough's fourth quarter game-winning drive last week, it is the first time a Saints signal-caller has had fourth quarter/overtime game-winning drives in consecutive contests since Drew Brees in Weeks Five (team had bye in Week Six), Seven and Eight of the 2020 season.
- His 12-yard touchdown pass to WR **Chris Olave** put Shough at six for the season, tying Archie Manning's rookie mark of six, set in 1971.

- With the win today against the Panthers, Shough is the first Saints rookie QB to ever win a start in the Caesars Superdome and the first to win back-to-back starts.
- Neal led the backfield until being ruled out of the game after halftime (hamstring). He carried seven ties for 28 yards with one touchdown. He also caught one pass for four yards.
- WRs **Chris Olave** led all receivers in yards and receptions, catching six passes for 85 yards and a touchdown. HE caught a touchdown to tie up the game at 17-17 late in the fourth quarter, and caught four of his six receptions for 63 yards in two minutes and eight seconds.
- TE **Juwan Johnson** assisted in the receiving effort with four receptions for 30 yards. With those four catches, he has now totaled 61 catches on the season, joining Jimmy Graham (2011-14) and Benjamin Watson (2015) as only the third Saints tight end with 60 catches in a season.
- The New Orleans defense surrendered only 281 total net yards including only 154 net yards passing. After giving up 74 yards on 16 carries in the first half, the Saints run defense tightened up, giving up only 53 yards on 15 carries (3.5 avg.) in the second half
- LB **Demario Davis** posted five tackles (four solo). He also played in his 224th career game, tying Pro Football Hall of Famer Derrick Brooks (Class of 2014) for 11th all-time in NFL history among linebackers.
- DE **Chase Young** recorded six total tackles (four solo), one sack and two tackles for loss. His six tackles today is his season-high and ties his previous career-best.
- That sack on Panthers signal-caller Bryce Young was his sixth of the season and his third in the past four games.
- Young, rookie S **Jonas Sanker** and DE **Jonathan Bullard** all led the tackling effort today with six stops each. Bullard had a key fourth down stop of Panthers RB Chuba Hubbard on the Saints 35-yard line early in the fourth quarter.
- Rookie CB **Quincy Riley** led the team with a season-high two pass breakups. Riley also recorded two total tackles (one solo).
- LB **Pete Werner** finished with three solo tackles and one fumble recovery on the game's final play to set a new career-high with three on the season after recording two in 2023.
- LB **Danny Stutsman** continues to shine on special teams, leading the way with a team-best two stops to increase his season total to 13. LB **Isaiah Stalbird** had one to increase his season total to 14.
- Including postseason contests, DE **Cam Jordan** played in his 251st career game, tying PFHOF DE Reggie White and DE Ron McDole for sixth all-time in NFL history among defensive linemen. Jordan finished with three solo tackles.
- LS **Zach Wood** played in his 146th career game, tying WR Marques Colston for 16th all-time in Saints history.
- Smyth made both of his PAT attempts, a 42-yard field goal and a 47-yard game-winning field goal with two seconds remaining.

“Awesome game. Awesome game of resiliency, the group kind of sticking together. I think it’s a good example of not every game is going to be perfect. There’s going to be highs and lows. For our guys to stick together, that’s a beautiful formula for a comeback win like that. All three phases contributed.”

“Just a phenomenal performance. When your best is needed, he showed up. Obviously, he made some big-time plays. From a pass-game perspective on the last couple of drives, I thought our receivers were dialed (in). (Devaughn) Vele goes down, and Kevin (Austin Jr.) pops in there and makes some plays. I thought it was big time.”

“I just felt like our guys executed really well. Positive gains allow you to play with some tempo and some urgency. I thought our guys executed really well in those situations.”

got some plays called. I thought all of those guys executed really well. I think it shows Tyler is trusting the progression, whoever's open is open and playing to play."

(On how the team has come together over the last two weeks)

"It's just been awesome, resiliency for our guys. Obviously, we are not going to be able to go to the playoffs this year, but we are building something really special and doing it the right way. Every single guy in that locker room, the way they prepare and compete and stay together through every experience - the last two weeks have been an awesome example of these guys."

(On what he saw in K Charlie Smyth throughout the game-winning field goal)

"I did not bother him. I just stayed away from him. He was ready to go. This team has so much confidence in him. I think the juice and energy that provides –the guys have a lot of confidence when he goes out there. The guys are fired up for him. For him to make that kick and execute at that high of a level, the celebration in the locker room, you'll see it with Charlie and the team. This team loves that guy, and it was awesome."

(On the QB sneak in the fourth quarter)

"We felt like it was going to be as tight as it possibly could. We were at a 66-yarder (field goal) at the time. We could take that. It's a long one for Charlie. It felt like five more yards would be huge. We just had to make sure everyone was on the same page and dialed in on that whole operation. It's something we work. Each and every week, we go through these situations. I felt like we needed a couple more yards to put ourselves in an even better position for Charlie."

(On the win at home)

"It's just awesome. I thought the Dome (Caesars Superdome) came to life. Obviously, that was a really cool example of how as that game went on and we caught a little bit of confidence and got a little momentum, I felt like the crowd got into it late in the game. It was awesome. It was an awesome atmosphere for our guys to kind of rally together with. It's a good example of what our team's built."

(On Shough going into the medical tent during the game)

"There was one time where they checked (for a concussion). He was OK. Obviously, he was fine."

(On if he checked in with Shough)

"They communicate well with me, and I knew he was ready to roll."

(On Shough getting hit when sliding)

"Obviously, those are challenging positions for defenders as well, quarterbacks sliding. I thought Tyler did a good job of getting the yards, getting down. Obviously, the penalties occurred, and there was a benefit toward us because of that."

(On DE Chase Young's performance)

"Just effort and resiliency. Not everything is perfect on film. We are going to have plenty of things to correct as a team. I thought for Chase to just keep going for it, keep going for it, keep going for it, eventually he has a big moment late in the game."

(On the defense's consistent fourth-and-one stops)

"It's just incredible. I think it's confidence-building. A lot of times you get to a fourth-and-one, those are challenging situations. Our team has so much confidence that we are making these stops each and every opportunity we have. It's obviously been a huge impact on a number of these wins for us."

(On what constitutes "building it the right way")

"Just getting the right people and just building this thing around people who are connected like no other. Each and every week, each and every circumstance, no matter what it is. I think that is a credit to our guys. For the last two weeks, to respond coming out of that Atlanta game and coming back and responding the way we have the last two weeks is just credit to the people we have in the locker room and their connection, but also their willingness and effort to get better and take advantage of each opportunity."

(On playing well in December)

"We talk about December football is really, really important football. Ours is a slightly different path this year, but we have to create habits now that we play meaningful games in December. We create these big-time opportunities for us. These last couple of games are division games, and these are teams we are going to play a couple of times a year for the rest of time. These are meaningful games that will impact the future as well."

(On having a challenge go in favor of the Saints)

"I finally got one. I felt like it was going to go for a full year. We were close."

(On the rookies at this point in the year)

"It's just an awesome class, a bunch of guys who are just getting better with every opportunity. They are playing all their different roles, and I think that's the beauty of this team. When these guys have opportunities, they're ready, they're dialed (in), they have all the confidence in the world, and they're ready to execute at a high level."

(On Smyth's range being at 65 yards)

"We were kind of right around that range there. Those are long field goals, obviously. You can look at the percentages of those. We felt like getting a couple of extra yards was going to be beneficial."

(On Smyth's patience)

"I think it's just a good example of a ton of things—the international program, practice squad development, guys that are continuing to learn at each and every opportunity. It's a perfect example of what our league loves, and loves to represent is opportunities for people from all across the world now. Charlie's taking advantage of that."

(On injury updates)

"We had a few guys who left the game. Obviously, we will get the full update tomorrow with the medical thing with Devin [Neal], Devaughn [Vele], Cesar [Ruiz]. Those three guys obviously weren't able to come back, so we will get clarification tomorrow."

(On what he saw from RBs Evan Hull and Audric Estime)

"I thought they took advantage of their opportunities, big time plays in the run game and the pass game with a couple of screens in there. Those guys did an awesome job of getting vertical and getting a bunch of yards out of those. Those were critical."

PANTHERS HEAD COACH DAVE CANALES

(Opening statement)

"First and foremost, got to give credit to the Saints, taking advantage of their opportunities and putting together some amazing drives. There is stuff we certainly have to look at and make sure that we [Carolina] sure up. As far as we're concerned, just the penalties. The penalties is really what killed us. We gave up some third and longs and when you do that, you don't give yourself a chance. You know, when you're sitting in first and 20s and those types of things, then the untimeliness of the penalties, you know, the field goal block two offsides, you're giving them [New Orleans] another opportunity. In that fourth and one we end up getting the stop, but still, you know, gives them another shot there. We talk about our play style and about playing smart and finish. That did not show up for us today, and that's something that we certainly have to talk about."

(On if he considered kicking a field goal on that final fourth and one that did not convert)

"With inches to go, I felt confident in our guys. I wanted to give Chuba [Hubbard] the ball on that play, make that first down, and continue that drive right there. So, we made that decision. It didn't work out for us. I couldn't pass up on fourth and inches right there. I trust my guys to get that done. We've been really successful in those situations, but the Saints beat us on that play."

(On the mood in the locker room after letting an opportunity slip to control the NFC South)

"Yeah, there's two things going on. There's a lot of guys who are really disappointed because of the missed opportunity that we had, and at the same time, there's a lot of great leaders in that locker room that understand we got a lot of football in front of us. We have to make sure that we move on quickly. We look at the film and make sure we tidy up the things that we need to and get ready for the next game. And that's really got to be the mentality so that we stay together and finish this thing."

(On the last roughing the passer penalty and the difficulty of making that play)

"Those are difficult plays, but we have to be smarter in those situations. You know, Tyler [Shough] has done a great job running the ball in different situations. We just have to be better about approaching that tackle and making sure that we're not leading with our shoulder, because as he goes down, you're going to end up in that head and neck area. They were good calls. Those are just situations we have to be more aware of when you're facing a mobile quarterback."

(On attributed to the volume of untimely penalties)

"I don't know that. Maybe it's coming off the bye week. The results in not having penalties has been the discipline of how we how we've been playing, and for all those penalties to show up the way that they did today, it's something that we have to attack head on and have conversations about when they happen, how they occurred, and make sure that doesn't happen again."

(On the last offensive drive)

"We were just trying to take advantage of our matchups and the coverages that I was seeing them [New Orleans] roll out there. We didn't get much out of it. Bryce [Young] took a scramble and made a play for us, but I thought they [New Orleans] did a good job of matching it. At the end of the day, whether it's zone or man, it ends up in one-on-one matchups, and we count on our guys to get that done."

(On what worked so well for New Orleans offense)

"We had a few unfortunate misses, but we were attacking the ball the right way. The effort was there, the physicality, the style of play that we're looking for was there, but the execution was not and that's the part that we have to look at and talk to the guys about."

(On his messaging towards the team moving forward)

"Yeah, just get back to work. Trust in our process. It'll lead to good results. Make sure that we look at the things, learned from this, learn from the mistakes that happened throughout this game, so that we can go play our best football because that was not it today."

(On going back home with three games remaining in the regular season)

"We are fortunate to be in this position where we can play Tampa Bay, a division opponent, twice in the last three games. To me, it plays into a great opportunity for us, but it's going to be about the toughness, mental toughness, to be able to move on, focus on the Bucs this week and make sure that we sure up

QB TYLER SHOUGH

(On what it means to get a win like this in New Orleans)

"It was huge—for me it was, and just personal for all the guys. Coming back here, I felt like we had played well on the road, but we wanted to show the fans what we could do here just as a team collectively. Just the resiliency. It was a lot of fun. I was proud of everybody throughout the whole game, especially against a really good team, two playoff teams kind of back-to-back. It was just a lot of fun."

(On how he played the last two drives & what was different)

"I think throughout the game we just were not able to sustain some of the stuff and kind of get into on-the-ball scenarios, and they did a good job of mixing things up. But I think in those, we were all on the same page, and we were going to go drive down and score and everybody was clicking. So preparedness and operation field nod was going through my head the whole time. So I was operating, and I was proud of the whole offense, being able to sustain that and get down there. Obviously we'd like to get in the end zone as much as we can, but it was a great, great finish."

(On rising to the occasion)

"Yeah, I just, I felt prepared, you know, I felt prepared with it. And for me, I like being able to just, they know we're throwing it, we're going to throw it, and just go out there and get it. Yeah, (Devaughn) Vele, he had some insane catches. I had to put some better ball placement on him, but he's unbelievable when it comes to just throwing it in his radius. All those guys stepped up. (Chris) Olave, he wasn't getting a lot of action early on, but the way he kind of stepped up—it was unbelievable for him and Kevin (Austin Jr.) and everybody. I was just really proud of him. It's tough whenever you're not getting the ball early on. You have ebbs and flows. It's a tough position, so the resiliency of those guys, the resiliency of the whole line, it was just a great effort."

(On his teammates saying that they are confident in him)

"That's why I play football, really. I think that's why any of us are out there is because when you can make the game simple as far as you're out there playing with your boys and you're out there operating on an every single day basis, that's what's fun to me. It means a lot coming from those guys because I have full trust in them, and we put them in some tough scenarios. They responded time and time again, and I think that's how we can operate as a team when we're playing together and trust each other."

(On the final drive)

“It was laser focus. We worked in that scenario every single day. Our defense knows that play like the back of their hand because they are, like, sick and tired of us. We do so much situational football, and that’s a credit to Kellen (Moore) and all the guys and all the coaches. And we got the look that we wanted, and it was everybody on the same page, and it was a great finish.”

(On how often they run situational football in practice)

“I would say every week. But, yeah, since training camp, every week, those end-of-game, end-and-a-half scenarios at least once per week.”

(On how long the slide, get up, spike play takes)

“Usually you’re going for 13 seconds. Cutting off at 12 is a little bit risky. I mean, it can be done, but I knew how to get down. I may have sold a little bit because I know we didn’t have any timeouts. So, I mean, it definitely hurt, but I was good. And we had to be in that scenario. We were going to clock it.”

(On the last play and Spencer Rattler playing a snap)

“Yeah, I was fine, but we had to do it. And, yeah, just got to be smart, get down earlier. But, yeah, it ended up working out.”

(On ‘selling it a little bit’)

“Yeah. I mean, it was, I don’t know how to say any of this, but it was just a great effort. But, yeah, it was.”

(On what he went into the tent for the first time)

“I took a knee on that fourth down, right on my hip. They put a pad on it. Yeah, it was definitely hurting, but I knew it was good as long as I could throw and move around. But, yeah, it should be good to go.”

(On if they were playing a different defense that he felt he could take advantage of or if he needed to be aggressive)

“A little bit of both. We were obviously going to be aggressive as much as we can. And we knew we had to get chunks. A lot of the stuff earlier on, we were trying to keep the ball moving positively. But in those scenarios, you have to be a little aggressive that way, just with time management-wise and how much time you have on the clock. So it was great play calling by Kellen, great operation by all the guys.”

(On the 17-play drive)

“It just builds confidence as an offense and sustainability, because that’s what I feel like the Panthers have been really good at, is just possessing the ball. And we knew that we had to do that ourselves. We had to sustain those drives. That’s the name of the game in the NFL, really, is you’ve got to stay on the field. Give your defense that break, and obviously you’re operating, you want to drive. So it was a really, really good effort by all the guys, because you get tired down at the end. You’ve got to mentally train, physically train, but you train for those moments.”

(On Kellen Moore’s comment about building something and if he feels it in the locker room)

“Yeah, for sure. It feels like week Three within the locker room. It feels like we are gearing up, hitting our track. I think we’re just having fun. I think at the same time, we’re building something here that we

all want to be here forever, and we're here to stay. So it's a lot of fun being around the guys every single day, but knowing we have to go back to our process. All the results come if we kind of continue what we're doing process-wise and have fun day-to-day."

(On not having Vele or Cesar Ruiz for the game-tying and game-winning drives)

"Yeah, it's tough. I'm not sure on the status of those guys, but obviously, they're huge. They're huge for us because of the plays that they're making, who they are as individuals and people. So hopefully they will be good. But I was really proud of how everybody stepped up in that role. And nobody blinked. Audric (Estime), Evan (Hull), Kevin, all those guys, nobody blinked. They stepped up and made plays."

(On what he's saying to the team when getting the ball back with one minute left)

"One play at a time. Let's go get it. Everybody was on the same page—we're not going to get it back all in one play, but how can we play each play for its own and go get it done? So, I could see it on everybody's face, and I would just constantly talk to them, 'Hey, let's go win this right here. Let's go win this.' This is why you do it. Train, focus, and everybody operated really well."

(On coming out of the injury tent and what he was thinking)

"I just wanted to make sure I could throw, just grab the ball and throw. So, once I did that, I was good. And then once the adrenaline kicks in, you don't feel it until you're off the field."

(On if the coaches checked in with him)

"Yeah, the trainers communicated with the coaches constantly, so they came up to me, and I was just saying, I'm good to go, we're good. So, part of it."

(On his level of confidence in Charlie Smyth when he came off the field)

"100% confidence. We had no doubt—he does that every single day in practice. He had been great throughout the game so far. I know just seeing it on his face, you've got to have a level of cold blood in this to kind of play that position. So, I had full confidence in him. You know, you're waiting to see it go in, but, I think everybody knew what the result was going to be."

(On the touchdown to Olave)

"Yeah, I have full confidence in Chris. That's my guy. That's our guy. He's going to win one-on-one no matter what. If I give him a chance, and, I've got to continue to give him more chances. He made a huge play, a great route, and a great catch. We got the look that we wanted on that, and it was just an unbelievable, unbelievable job. He came up big there."

(On coming back to Olave)

"100%. I told him I'd come right back to him. I'm coming right back to him. I could have put it out there a bit earlier, and outside, so part of that's on me to make it not a bang-bang play. So, I was telling him, 'Hey, man, all the guys, I'm coming right back to you. We're going to get in the end zone.' So, mentally, I think I've seen just him be so sharp, as just that guy, and I was really proud of him and how he responded."

(On what it means to him to show people he can fight through injury, given his past)

"Yeah, it's just part of the game of football, and a lot of the injuries I have are fluke bone breaks that suck timing-wise. So, as I said, it's part of it. You're going to get bumps and bruises. You've got to play through stuff. I understand the narrative at the time, but I think, obviously, it's helped me out more than

anything, mentally, being able to just grind through all that adversity—being able to see a different point of view from that standpoint. So, I think everybody's battling through stuff, and I think that's why you show up every single day to go out there and battle."

(On what went well on the screen)

"It's just a great play call. You know, he stepped up big there. Just extremely explosive. A great job on the O-line as well. It's not an easy play to get out there in space and make those blocks. So, he just stepped up really big."

(On the growth from his rookie class)

"I think it's twofold. Just the mental fortitude to understand throughout the season, going through, you know, our own process, having fun each day. It's a long journey from January, training for the draft, going through interviews nonstop into OTAs, and you're kind of just drinking through a fire hose, and you don't really know what you don't know, and I think there's a lot of growth that is necessary through that moment. So, I think all the guys are seeing them flourish with their own process and their own, you know, kind of position, and it's just a credit to the staff, the whole team. We're brothers off the field. It's one of the closest rookie classes and groups I've been a part of, and so I think we're just having fun being around each other."

(On his comment about it feeling like week Three, and if that has to do with him becoming the starting quarterback)

"I'm just trying to do my job and operate within that realm. It feels that way because I think we're playing off of each other really well, and I think everybody's just having fun—coming to work each day, we're having fun doing it. So, obviously, it's a long season, and we still have a lot of football that has to be played. So, there's just an encouragement of, you know, let's keep going, let's keep it going."

(On having big performances in the fourth quarter for three straight games, and how that impacts his confidence)

"For me, it is just a reminder of how important the preparation is and just, keep stepping up to the plate, really. We would like to continue to start faster, and how I can facilitate that. But for me, it shows resiliency of our whole offense and our whole team, the special teams, defense. Everybody is on the same page—we are going to grind it out. We are always in this game. So, it is just a whole confidence for the whole team."

(On if the team's recent success is an example of the team's staying the course)

"Yeah, I think staying the course is the right phrase. Obviously, settling in is a tough thing, because there's so much change throughout the year with different guys. So, I think the message that you try and preach from Ted (Rath), our strength coach, with Kellen, is one—going through your process, which I said before, and then just going for it. So, I think when you have that mindset of, I'm going to step up to the plate, and I'm going to attack each day, and whoever's in, everybody's kind of in that same mode of operation. So, if you can get everybody on the same page and we're here to have fun regardless of the circumstances, we're here to do our job, and then good things can happen."

DE Chase Young

(On his big sack at the end of the game)

“I believe the tight end was on the ball, so I knew I had a little bit more width. Tried to show speed, and I just converted to power.”

(On running down Bryce Young on third down)

“Do not let him do the first down. More so that last play, I was like, okay, he going to run. He has been running. And it was kind of like that the whole game. Sometimes I catch myself high. He go through the big sack. He wasn't dropping too far back in the pocket. It was hard to have been edged at six yards. So it was more so. It just had to be as big to power. And that play—somebody had to make it. You know what I'm saying?”

(On this being the second straight week where the defense gets to play a big role in a close victory)

“We fight. We fight. I give my hats off to our leader, Coach (Brandon) Staley. A hell of a leader. He is always challenging us. He's always talking about controlling what we can control. Great leader—Demario Davis—he keep us on it. Always challenging us every day. You know, we got a real good group. We really feed off each other. We're family. And that's all you can ask for.”

(On Kellen Moore's comment about building something here, and if he feels that)

“I do. I do. Like Double D (Demario Davis) said—I think maybe last week or two weeks ago—how you can respond when everything isn't going your way. I feel like if you look at our team, regardless, we never stop fighting. I feel like that's just all you can ask for. I do, man. Tyler Shough—He built. Every week, I can just tell, he's getting more comfortable. He just started to look like that guy. You know what I'm saying?”

(On what goes into him timing the snap so well)

“That's just playing ball. You got it or you don't. You look at a lot of stuff, the hand movement, the guard always tapping, they do the little head nod, all that. But you look at that film, you've got to watch the film to really get that. And as the game goes on, you know, you make mistakes. I jumped a little bit—It was a hair shy, right? But, it happens sometimes. And I'm just glad that God gave me the ability to make that play.”

(On how back-to-back wins feel after having a lot of close games)

“Feels good. Feels good. Guess, Coach, he felt like we earned a victory Monday. Haven't had one of those in a little minute. So, it feels good. Feels good.”

(On the confidence in Shough, knowing that he can get the job done)

“All power to Shough. He's doing whatever he's doing, and you've got to get him to keep doing it.”

(On confidence in Charlie Smyth to make the kick)

“Everybody on the team, we always had confidence in Charlie. He is hitting 60, 70 yards in practice all the time. And Charlie, he was ready for that moment. He is always dialed in in practice. He is really hard on himself. His whole journey, he couldn't make that many mistakes to be able to be where he is, right now. So, hats off to Charlie. He came in clutch.”

(On looking at the schedule and the probability of going on a run to end the season on a positive note)

“You know, we’re going to take it one day at a time. We’re going to go in on Wednesday. We’re going to look at this film still. And, I still made a couple of mistakes because no game is perfect. So, that’s where we’re at right now. We’re locked in on what will be day-to-day.”

(On seeing the divisional opponent twice, and causing Bryce Young to stress twice)

“Yeah, it feels good. But hats off to the whole D-line. I mean, we were communicating a lot out there. And Staley, he said before this game, we were going to be on the front four. We were rushing forward. We weren’t bringing no blisters. We were going to be on the front four to get nine (Bryce Young) down. We were up and down a little bit throughout the game, but at the end of the day, we got it done—that’s all that matters.”

(On QB Performance)

“It’s huge. Having somebody back there that’s fearless. He took a great amount of hits today, kept bouncing back in, and getting back up, so that shows a lot as a leader, and it is great for the team. We got to keep up the momentum and keep winning.

(On seven-yard game until the game-tying drive for him that he played such a pivotal part of)

“It was tough. I’m not gonna let my emotions, or anything get in the way of the flow of the game, that’s just how the game was going. It wasn’t coming my way. ____ was having a huge game until you went down. We were still in the game 17-10 and it was a tough drive: Second down in the red zone. Had a bounce back, made some plays, and somebody had to make a play. I’m glad he kept coming to me. I’m glad we put a drive together to tie the game up and getting the ball back and getting a field goal was huge, so it was a great thing for us.

(On Touchdown play)

“We got the coverage we wanted. We had two players for zone and man. We got the exact thing we wanted, our one on one on one match up for the boundary. We just had to make a play at the end of the day. He was kind of inside leverage, but he still threw the ball and he trusted me to win. He threw a great ball, a great placement. We made the play

(On Message to the team after plays)

I’m just trying to bounce back from that dropping, and like I said, somebody had to make a play. I’m glad Tyler trusted in me. I think it was 50 seconds left, and we are down inside our 20, and I was like, here we go. Great confidence in the offense, the talent in the offense, they have been clutch these past couple games. So, yeah, look, I'm just delighted to get the opportunity. And look, we've got a great operation here. Like, I never even have to think about the ball being in the right spot because Zach (Wood) and Kai (Kroeger) are so good. It was a good moment, and one I'll never forget."

(On if he was ready to hit it from 66 yards out)

"Yeah, there was, there's a part of me that was like I have got confidence from that range. I have hit a lot of the longer ones in pre-game recently. I suppose when you get in those moments you get more adrenaline. For me, that means I get more power in the kick. So that's the way I like to channel it. You know, 47 we'll take it a little easier. But look, I was ready to hit that one if we needed it as well. It was a good moment. You know, the base and the protection as well today, got really good feedback. So I was just delighted."

(On what he does to stay calm before big moments like this)

"I like being, you know, I like just standing around with Zach and Kai. And then you go back to what you've done before. So I remember my first kick in the preseason last year, it was a game winner. I call it an evidence wall. Any chance we've had, I think the records are pretty good so, just going back to that, you know, the boys did a great job getting us in that position. Yeah, I'm pretty excited right now, to be honest."

(On his job before this being a school teacher)

"Yeah, I graduated as a primary school teacher with Irish language in the summer of 2023 and then started kicking footballs at the start of August. I had signed up to do a Master's at home as well, and some areas in Belfast, but then the kicking footballs kind of got in the way of that. Then, I was told there was a chance to go and kick at the combine in

Indianapolis which I was very much aware of because of how big a fan of the sport I was back home. And, you know, once the NFL was mentioned, I was like, this is what's meant to be. I had a skill in my other sport, to get a football where I could kick the ball pretty far and accurately. I kind of thought I had a good chance to translate it over to the NFL."

(On if he would have anticipated this back then)

"I suppose if 27 months or so ago, you told me I would be playing a game in the NFL, I probably would have laughed at you. I never would have thought I'd have the chance of coming over here and playing sports, even in college or whatever, because I didn't know what way the eligibility system worked. But, you know, just the way things panned out, it's been really a dream scenario. And, you know, like, again, I've been such a fan of sport for so long, and always thought I could kind of do it. And, yeah, look, it was just awesome. I love it here, you know, this city has treated me really well, this organization, everybody you know, to even look at me in the first place when I had no football experience. I'm just so grateful to everybody in this organization that has helped me develop. Look, I think we're going to reap the rewards from that now."

(On how many text messages he has received since the game concluded)

"I don't know, I remember after the Miami game it was probably over 1000 and it was pretty crazy. But, yeah, I haven't really had the chance to look at the phone yet, so that's, yeah, I'd say it's, in my opinion not my top priority, I'm not sure."

(On when he knew the game-winner was good)

"I suppose you feel the contact right, and then you just give a quick glance and see what's going on. I think I've got a habit of looking, seeing if it's good, then sort of turning away. I'm not really in control of my body at that stage, you know, whatever happens, happens. And I think it might have looked at their sideline, and probably shouldn't have done that, but a division opponent, you know, is a big rivalry or whatever. So it was a fun moment for sure."

(On if he's going to frame this moment)

"I don't know what's going to happen, but look, I definitely never forget it anyway. So look, you know for me, I'm still on the practice squad, so I want to be part of this team. I want to play here and I love it here. It nearly feels like home here, obviously in America. I feel like I've got two homes, so it's pretty cool. I'll just do the thing and the rest will take care of itself."

(On his game-winning field goal)

"Yeah, look, it is pretty good. I mean, every kicker in the NFL, I mean, I would like to think most guys in the league would dream of having game winners. And it is a pretty good moment. It's where you feel like you can really help win games for your team. And obviously all the other kicks before that are just as important. But those moments do mean

a lot. And then, I suppose the outside world would say there's a lot of pressure on you, but I like to think I embrace those moments. I know it's gonna be perfect, and it's just up to you to go out and execute everything you've been practicing for the last two years."

(On bouncing back from the missed field goal last week)

"Yeah, and, well, I just looked at it. It was strictly just a technical thing. I watched the film back, and it was great. Actually, this week was alumni week, and we had John Carney in so it was just a perfect week to get working with John and take a look at the film and even analyze some of the makes I've had in practice and games and like, what's the ball doing, and what way am I lined up? You know, just just little, small technical things. And I knew it wasn't like I was nervous in Tampa. It wasn't that. It was just a strictly technical thing, and I think we took a look at the film and made the corrections this week."

(On working with John Carney before)

"Yeah, I've worked with John. I first met John, and I think it was June of (20)24 of last year, just before training camp. And he was really good. And, even just some of the basics, fundamentals, like they are still that make controllable thoughts that I've learned from John. And he's had a great career here as well. I see him up in the banner as part of the Super Bowl winning team. So, yeah he's a part of this place. And it was good. I got to chat to Garrett Hartley yesterday as well. So it's pretty good to get to kick for a team of guests with such star kickers as part of their franchise for this city and this place, and wanting to be here."

(On having this moment in New Orleans)

"Yeah, it was awesome. It is pretty cool here with the Saints fans and cheering like that. I think the crowd got really, really loud today on the third and fourth downs. And look, it definitely helps if this place is rocking. And, it's pretty cool. And it's up to us to give the fans moments like that to celebrate. I came into the city and didn't know much about it when I first came here. It's hot. It's pretty good the night before. I love it, the people are great, you know, everybody is just Saints mad here. I don't think there's too many cities like that in America where the football team is literally the main market of the city. We just want to give this city a winning team, and I would love to be a part of that."

(On still telling Uber drivers he is a tourist)

"Yeah, hopefully. I don't know, it's a good job now I'm driving, so we don't have to, kind of but, I mean, I remember last year just giving them up, making up all the stories and whatever, with my Irish accent in New Orleans, so just trying to, we're just visiting. It's a

pretty good place, good tourist spot, given the whole group an apartment or whatever. And, have a bit of fun there."

DE CAMERON JORDAN

(On the team building this year and for the future)

"We are fighting each and every day. We are building. We only have three games left. This locker room has been so great. We have been building towards confidence. Confidence is key. There have been plenty of games where we have been within three points, within one possession. If we establish confidence early, that carries over. Now, we see our offense is like, 'We know we can get some points.' It's a great feeling to have. We are building to a better locker room. We are building towards a better team."

(On the development of Tyler Shough)

"You go look at his tape and there is a reason why he led Louisville to where he did. There is a reason why when he got his turn, he has shown (his ability). He had time to develop. You don't just create a diamond. A diamond is out of pressure, hard work effort. It's stuck in the earth. It's got to be compacted into what it is. It starts off as dirt (or) coal, whatever. It's got to get (turned) into a diamond. Hopefully, it's going to be a diamond. He is being molded. He's developing. In a few games, you have seen how much growth he has shown. That is potential. Let's go capture it each and every game. Let's leave nothing unturned...Guys are playing with so much heart. It just hasn't turned our way (a lot). Now you see that we are winning. All of a sudden, we are winning these close games. That builds confidence. I wish there was another 13 games in the season."

CB QUINCY RILEY

(On the team improving)

"I don't want to speak too much for the future, but as we grow together, we move closer. I am glad to be in the (rookie) class with those guys. I think that we have something special going on."

(On what goes through his mind when the defense makes a stop and allows the Saints' offense to take over with a chance to win)

"That gives us a good feeling and just trusting our offense, like we got the ball back for y'all. That just brings the team together. Offense (feels) like defense got us, now we know the offense has got us and we just go play together...Win, lose or draw, we just know that we have each other's back."

(On where he felt the game slipping away after the third quarter)

"It was just lack of execution. Credit to them, they played well, and we always got to give credit to our opponents. For us, we're a team that prides ourselves on the finish, and we didn't get that done today. It's not going to feel good for 24 hours, but we're going to go back, grow from it, and turn the page."
