THE MATCHUP

The New Orleans Saints [2-1] will play at the Atlanta Falcons [1-2] in the front end of the first of a pair of two-game road trips in the 2024 season, as they seek to remain in at least a tie for first place in the NFC South. Kickoff at Mercedes-Benz Stadium is set for Noon CT on Sunday.

New Orleans is coming off a 15-12 loss to the Philadelphia Eagles on Sunday. The two longtime NFC rivals battled for nearly all 60 minutes until Saints QB **Derek Carr** was intercepted by Eagles S **Reed Blankenship** with 48 seconds remaining.

New Orleans had gotten out of the gates quickly for the third consecutive week this season in the opening possession when K **Blake Grupe** kicked a 34-yard field goal. Then the New Orleans defense forced a three-and-out on Philadelphia's first possession, powered by all three tackles involving DE **Carl Granderson**, including a sack split with CB **Alontae Taylor**.

The 3-0 score stood until the fourth quarter, as the Saints defense stopped the Eagles on five straight trips into their territory, including a **Tyrann Mathieu** interception, a forced fumble by Granderson and fumble recovery by LB **Willie Gay Jr.**, two fourth down stops and a blocked punt.

Following the blocked punt by DB **J.T. Gray**, New Orleans took possession at the Philadelphia 27-yard line. However, New Orleans wouldn't come away with any points as RB **Alvin Kamara** was stopped for no gain on fourth-and-one at the Eagles 18-yard line. Four players later, Eagles RB **Saquon Barkley** sprinted for a 65-yard touchdown to give Philadelphia a 7-3 lead with 13:17 remaining in the contest.

The Saints subsequently got the ball back and Grupe knocked in a 38-yard field goal to make it 7-6. After a 60-yard Philadelphia field goal attempt fell short, Carr engineered a nine-play, 50-yard scoring drive that ended with a 13-yard touchdown connection to WR **Chris Olave** and a 12-7 Saints lead. Philadelphia QB **Jalen Hurts** engineered a five-play, 69-yard drive, that ended with a Barkley four-yard TD run and a two-point conversion rush to give the Eagles the 15-12 edge.

Despite the loss, New Orleans is tied for first place in the NFC South with Tampa Bay [2-1], who hosts Philadelphia.

The Saints and Falcons have played 109 regular season games since 1967 with New Orleans leading the series 55-54. In 2024, each team won the contest they hosted, with the Saints defeating Atlanta 48-17 in the regular season finale.

THE HEAD COACHES



Dennis Allen was hired as the 17th head coach in New Orleans Saints history on February 8, 2022. Now in his 29th year coaching and 23rd in the NFL, Allen has spent 14 seasons

in New Orleans in two separate stints, including six-and-a-half campaigns (2015-21) as the team's defensive coordinator prior to being promoted to head coach.

During his 23 years of coaching in the NFL, Allen has worked with 13 players who have combined for 26 Pro Bowl selections and he has also coached two *Associated Press* NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year winners and three members of the Pro Football Hall of Fame.

Allen's defenses have consistently been among the most productive in the NFL in a number of categories, including scoring defense, total yards allowed and sacks. The team's defensive play-caller since the middle of the 2015 season, the Saints are the only team in the National Football League to rank in the top ten in opponent points per game each of the past four seasons.

In 2023, Allen guided the Saints to win four of their last five games as the team turned in a 9-8 performance, narrowly missing the playoffs. New Orleans finished 5-3 at home, winning their last three at the Caesars Superdome and captured their last three division contests, including convincing victories over Tampa Bay and Atlanta to close the season. New Orleans is off to a 2-1 start in 2024.

Prior to rejoining the Saints in 2015, Allen served as head coach of the Oakland Raiders from 2012-14 and as defensive coordinator of the Denver Broncos in 2011.

Allen played safety at Texas A&M from 1992-95, where he started the final 21 games of his career before being signed as an undrafted free agent by the Buffalo Bills in 1996. Prior to entering the National Football League coaching ranks in 2002, Allen served as a graduate assistant at his alma mater from 1996-99 and as a secondary coach at the University of Tulsa from 2000-01. He earned a bachelor of business administration degree and a master's in kinesiology from Texas A&M.

Raised in Hurst, Texas, Allen and his wife Alisson have a daughter, Layla and a son, Garrison.



Raheem Morris was named the 19th head coach in Atlanta Falcons history on Jan. 25, 2024. He took over the club after spending the previous three seasons as defensive coordinator of the Los Angeles Rams.

During his tenure with the Rams, Los Angeles made two postseason appearances and captured a title in Super Bowl LVI. From 2021-23, Los Angeles' defense recorded the fourth-best red-zone efficiency rating and the seventh-fewest rushing yards per game in the NFL. His 2023 unit was one of the youngest in the NFL, but helped the Rams earn a playoff berth and featured third-round rookie defensive lineman Kobie Turner, a finalist for the AP Defensive Rookie of the Year Award. Turner and Byron Young tallied a combined 17 sacks, finishing first and second among all rookies. Turner's nine sacks matched three-time NFL Defensive Player-of the Year Aaron Donald's franchise rookie record (nine in 2014), while Young's eight sacks ranked third among rookies in franchise history.

In 2022, Morris led a Rams defense that led the NFL in red-zone efficiency (44.4 percent), ranked second in goal-to-goal efficiency (53.3), seventh in interceptions (16) and ninth in defensive total rush EPA (42.97).

During the 2021 season that culminated in a Super Bowl title, Los Angeles' defense averaged 1.5 takeaways per game and featured three players - Donald, Leonard Floyd and Vonn Miller ranked in the top 20 in sacks. Additionally Morris' unit ranked third in sacks (50) and fifth in tackles for loss (85) during the regular season.

Morris also served as the Falcons' defensive coordinator and interim head coach in 2020 after four years (2016-19) as Atlanta's assistant head coach, wide receivers coach, offensive pass game coordinator and one season (2015) as the team's assistant head coach, defensive backs coach and defensive pass game coordinator. He served as defensive backs coach for Washington (2012-14) and the Tampa Bay Buccaneers (2007-08) and in between served three years (2009-11) as Tampa Bay's head coach. He started his NFL coaching career in Tampa Bay from 2002-05. Born and raised in Newark, N.J., Morris played safety at Hofstra from 1994-97 and graduated with a degree in physical education.

SERIES HISTORY

The Saints-Falcons regular season series is led 55-54 by the Saints, with New Orleans holding a 25-11 advantage over the Falcons since 2006. Since 1991, 36 games have been decided by eight points or less. The Falcons had a 10-game winning streak from 1995-99, which remains the Saints' longest winless streak against an opponent. New Orleans took 13-of-16 in the rivalry from 1986-94 and Atlanta won nine-straight over the fledgling Saints from 1969-73. Atlanta's most recent mastery over a five-year period ended with a 21-19 win for New Orleans at the Georgia Dome on Nov. 22, 2000. Eight games in the series have gone into overtime.

In the 109 regular season games of the series there has been:

- 2,344 points scored by New Orleans, 2,411 allowed.
- A ten-game Atlanta winning streak from 1995-99.
- A six-game win streak for New Orleans from 1986-89.
- 46 games decided by double-digits.
- 18 games decided by 21 or more points.
- 54 games decided by seven points or less.
- 4 games decided by one point.
- A 38-point win by Saints (11/1/87) - Biggest Saints win.
- A 55-point loss by Saints (9/16/73) - Biggest Saints loss.
- Four shutouts - Two by each club, the most recent a 38-0 Saints win in Atlanta on 11/1/87.
- Eight overtime games— four wins by each club.
- Six Monday night games, two Sunday night games and eight Thursday night games, including Thanksgiving night in 2018 and 2019.

The Saints will make their 2024 prime time debut on Monday Night Football, on Oct. 7, when they play the defending Super Bowl LVIII champion Kansas City Chiefs at GEHA Field at Arrowhead Stadium. The Saints trail the all-time series to the Chiefs 7-5 and will be looking to snap a three-game losing streak. The Saints have a 2-3 record in road contests. The last time the Saints played a defending Super Bowl champion was when they beat the Los Angeles Rams at the Caesars Superdome, 27-20 on Nov. 20, 2022. The last time New Orleans played a defending Super Bowl away from home was when they shutout Tampa Bay, 9-0 on Dec. 19, 2021.

2024 GAME SUMMARIES

WEEK 1: Saints 47, Carolina Panthers 10; September 8, 2024 @ Caesars Superdome - The Saints, behind three **Derek Carr** touchdown passes, two rushing touchdowns and four **Blake Grupe** field goals, defeated the visiting Carolina Panthers, 47-10, at the Caesars Superdome.

The Saints jumped out to a 30-0 lead, scored on their first nine possessions [tying a club record for scores on consecutive possessions] and held the ball for 36:39 in time of possession en route to the highest scoring total and most lopsided opening day result in team history. New Orleans won their sixth consecutive season opener, a club record and the current longest opener winning streak in the NFL.

The New Orleans defense also displayed their mettle, allowing only 193 total net yards of offense by the Panthers and held the Panthers to just one of ten third downs.

The Saints defense recorded three takeaways and CB **Alontae Taylor** became the first Saints defensive back to record three sacks in a contest, but fans were excited by the debut of a new-look offense that helped the Saints control the clock with a rushing game that gained 180 yards and two touchdowns largely behind **Alvin Kamara's** 83 yards.

Carr completed 19-of-23 passes [82.6 pct.] for 200 yards with three touchdown passes, zero interceptions and a 142.5 passer rating. The New Orleans defense harassed Carolina QB **Bryce Young** all day, as he completed only 13-of-30 passes for 161 yards with two interceptions and a 32.8 passer rating.

- With the win, the Saints improved to 23-35 in season openers and extend their club-record winning streak of season openers to six straight, currently the longest streak in the NFL.
- WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed** led New Orleans with 73 receiving yards on three receptions [24.3 avg.] with one touchdown reception from 59 yards out, the longest play of the game. Including 60 punt return yards, sparked by a 47-yard runback and a 33-yard kickoff return, Shaheed finished with 163 all-purpose yards to start the season.



- Carr connected with two of his tight ends, **Juwan Johnson** and **Foster Moreau** for touchdowns.
- 17 players made their Saints debuts: T **Taliese Fuaga**, G **Lucas Patrick**, LB **Willie Gay Jr.**, DB **Will Harris**, QB **Jake Haener**, WR **Cedrick Wilson Jr.**, CB **Kool-Aid McKinstry**, WR **Bub Means**, CB **Rico Payton**, P **Matthew Hayball**, LB **Khaleke Hudson**, LB **Anfernee Orji**, OL **Oli Udoh**, WR **Mason Tipton**, DTs **Kendal Vickers** and **Khristian Boyd** and DE **Chase Young**.
- With 83 yards rushing and five receptions for 27 yards, Kamara's 110 total yards from scrimmage gave him his 50th career game of at least 100 yards from scrimmage.

2024 GAME SUMMARIES

WEEK 2: Saints 44, Dallas Cowboys 19; September 15, 2024 @ AT&T Stadium - The Saints posted an impressive road victory against Dallas behind the powerful offensive firepower of RB **Alvin Kamara**, the arm of QB **Derek Carr**, the hands of WRs **Chris Olave** and **Rashid Shaheed** and two interceptions by the defense.

The Saints struck first on the opening drive as Carr led the offense down the field on a sequence ending with **Kamara** rushing for a five-yard touchdown. At the conclusion of Dallas' first drive, K **Brandon Aubrey** booted a 52-yard field goal. New Orleans struck right back for their second score of the first quarter on a 70-yard pass play from Carr to Shaheed to put New Orleans up 14-3.

Leading 35-16 at halftime, the Cowboys got the ball out of the second half and New Orleans moved Dallas out of the red zone in the first drive, when DT **Bryan Bresee** sacked QB **Dak Prescott** and forced him to fumble before it was recovered by Dallas at the New Orleans 22-yard line, forcing a 40-yard field goal. On New Orleans' next 13-play, 70-yard drive, Kamara capped things off with a seven-yard touchdown, his fourth score of the day.

In the fourth quarter, Carr was intercepted on a tipped pass, but on the next play, New Orleans got the ball back on an interception by S **Tyrann Mathieu**, his second takeaway of the season. On the ensuing drive, New Orleans closed out the scoring in the contest with a 26-yard field goal by K **Blake Grupe**. Carr completed 11-of-16 passes for 243 yards with two touchdown throws and one interception, while scoring one rushing touchdown for a 125.0 passer rating. Kamara led the club in rushing with a game-high 115 yards on 20 carries with three touchdowns to go with two receptions for 65 yards, including a career-long 57-yard scoring grab on a screen pass. Shaheed led the Saints in receiving with four grabs for 96 yards with the deep touchdown, reaching the end zone in his third consecutive contest dating back to 2023.

The Saints defense harassed Prescott, sacking him three times and forcing two interceptions. CB **Alontae Taylor** led the team with a career-high nine tackles, while CB **Paulson Adebo** had his first interception of the season and DE **Carl Granderson** picked up 1.5 sacks.

- The win marked the first time the Saints have won in Dallas since a 34-31 overtime victory on December 23, 2012.
- Carr's two touchdown passes moved him into a tie for 26th all-time with Boomer Esiason. With his next scoring pass, he will move into a tie for 25th with Tony Romo.
- Shaheed's career-long 70-yard touchdown reception gives him eight career touchdowns on offense and special teams.
- Mathieu's interception was the 34th of his career since coming into the league in 2013, the most in the NFL over that time.
- A stingy Saints run defense held the Cowboys to 68 yards rushing on 21 carries (3.2 avg.).
- The 91 points by New Orleans in their first two games are tied for the second-most in NFL history through the first two games of a season, behind the Saints' 93 point total in 2009.



WEEK 3: Philadelphia Eagles 15, Saints 12; September 22, 2024 @ Caesars Superdome - Philadelphia S **Reed Blankenship** intercepted Saints QB **Derek Carr** with 48 seconds left to preserve a 15-12 win over New Orleans in the Caesars Superdome.

The Saints had overcome an unsuccessful fourth-and-one conversion attempts and a 65-yard touchdown run by Eagles RB **Saquon Barkley** to take the lead in the fourth quarter with just over two minutes left, 12-7, with a field goal and a 13-yard touchdown connection from Carr and WR **Chris Olave**.

However, upon the Eagles getting the ball back, Philadelphia QB **Jalen Hurts** completed a pass to TE **Dallas Goedert** for a 61-yard gain and Barkley punch in a touchdown from four yards in. The Eagles improved to 2-1, while the Saints fell to 2-1.

Carr completed 14-of-25 passes for 142 yards with one touchdown and one interception. Olave had six receptions for 86 yards, including a 13-yard touchdown catch. RB **Alvin Kamara** rushed for 87 yards and caught three passes for 40 yards from 127 total yards from scrimmage.

DE **Carl Granderson** had 1.5 sacks and a forced fumble and DT **Bryan Bresee** tied a career-high with two quarterback takedowns. S **Tyrann Mathieu** had an interception, giving him takeaways in four straight games for the first time in his career dating back to the 2023 campaign. CB **Paulson Adebo** led the team with a career-high ten solo tackles and one pass breakup.

- The loss snapped a four-game winning streak, and a four-game home win streak.
- For the third consecutive game, the Saints scored on their first offensive possession with the Grupe field goal. It marked the first time since Weeks 17 and 18 of the 2022 season and the 2023 season opener, that the Saints scored on their opening possession in three consecutive games.

- Mathieu's interception was the 35th of his career since coming into the league in 2013. He and Minnesota's Harrison Smith are tied as the NFL's interception leaders among active players.
- Dating back to Week 17 of the 2023 season, New Orleans has won the takeaway battle in five consecutive contests.

Made a significant impact in the running game and passing game in New Orleans' 44-19 win at the Dallas Cowboys. Kamara carried 20 times for 115 yards (5.8 avg.) with three touchdowns and caught two passes for 65 yards, including a career-long 57-yard touchdown.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR

- With a Saints win, New Orleans would improve their record in the all-time series against Atlanta to 56-54.
- A Saints win would improve New Orleans' record on the season to 3-1 and at least keep them in a tie for first place in the NFC South with 2-1 Tampa Bay, who hosts Philadelphia on Sunday.
- A Saints victory on Sunday at Mercedes-Benz Stadium would give the Saints their first 2-0 start on the road since 2018. Dating back to a Week 17 win at Tampa Bay, it would also give them their first road winning streak of at least three games dating back to a three-game road winning streak in Weeks 16 and 17 of the 2022 season and Week Two of the 2023 campaign.
- A Saints win would even their record in road matchups at Atlanta to 28-28 in the series.
- A Saints win would improve Head Coach **Dennis Allen's** record against Atlanta to 4-1.
- New Orleans QB **Derek Carr** has 248 career touchdown passes, tied for 26th all-time in National Football League history with Tony Romo. Carolina Panthers signal caller Andy Dalton is ranked 25th with 249 and Drew Bledsoe 24th with 251. With two touchdowns, Carr would have the opportunity to have 250 career touchdown passes as well as move up in the rankings.

- Carr is ranked 25th all-time with 39,685 passing yards. With 315 passing yards, he will become the 25th player in National Football League history with 40,000.

- With his next appearance, LB **Demario Davis** will have played in 102 career games as a Saint and would move into a tie for 54th place in club record books with DL Bruce Clark, LS Justin Drescher, WR Joe Horn and RB Wayne Wilson.

- Davis has 693 career tackles as a Saint since 2018, needing seven to reach 700 for his Black and Gold career.

- TE **Taysom Hill**, whose next regular season appearance will be his 100th, has 38 career touchdowns, 11th in club records. With one more touchdown, he would tie WR Lance Moore for tenth in and with two would take sole possession of tenth.

- Hill's 27 career rushing touchdowns are tied for seventh in club record books with RB Tony Galtbreath. With one more rushing touchdown, he would move into a tie for fifth with RBs Chuck Muncie and Pierre Thomas and with two, he would move into sole possession of fifth.

- DE **Cameron Jordan's** 27 multi-sack games are tied for first in franchise record books with LB Ricky Jackson, needing one more to become the franchise's all-time leader. His six three-sack games also ties Jackson for first in club history, needing one more to become the franchise leader.

- Jordan has played in 212 career games, ranked 31st all-time among defensive linemen. On Sunday, he will play in his 213th career regular season game, moving into a tie with Steve McMichael [Pro Football Hall of Fame Class of 2024] and Henry Thomas for 29th.

- RB **Alvin Kamara's** team-record 83 touchdowns are tied for 62nd place in NFL record books with former Saints WR Brandon Marshall and WRs Joey Galloway and Anquan Boldin. With one touchdown, he would tie Pro Football Hall of Fame WR Calvin

Johnson [Class of 2021], Andre Rison and Herschel Walker at 59th and with two, would move into a tie for 57th with Pro Football Hall of Fame WR Tommy McDonald [Class of 1998] and Mark Clayton.

- Kamara's club-record 58 career rushing touchdowns are tied for 57th place all-time in National Football League record books with Mike Alstott and Jamal Lewis. With one rushing touchdown on Sunday, he would move into a tie for 56th place with former Saints teammate Latavius Murray and with two, he would move into a tie for 53rd place all-time with Terrell Davis [Pro Football Hall of Fame Class of 2017], Ahman Green and Brandon Jacobs.

- Kamara has 10,465 career total yards from scrimmage. With 88 yards from scrimmage on Sunday at Atlanta, Kamara would move into a tie for 100th all-time in NFL record books with wideout and former New Orleans Wide Receivers Coach Harold Jackson and with 89, he would take sole possession of 100th. With 105 yards, he would move into a tie for 99th place with WR Santana Moss and with 106 would move into sole possession of 99th. With 133 yards, he would move into a tie for 98th place with RB/WR Charley Taylor [Pro Football Hall of Fame Class of 1984] and with 134 would move into sole possession of 98th.

- Kamara's 515 career receptions rank fifth in club record books. With eight catches on Sunday, he would tie WR Joe Horn [2000-06] for fourth in club record books and with nine grabs would surpass Horn for sole possession of fourth.

- Kamara's seven career games with double-digit receptions are tied for second all-time in National Football League records among running backs with the Washington Commanders' Austin Ekeler. With double-digit receptions on Sunday, he would take sole possession of second.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR

- Kamara has 515 career receptions, tied for 13th place among National Football League running backs all-time with Emmitt Smith (Pro Football Hall of Fame Class of 2010). With one grab, he would surpass Smith for sole possession of 13th, with three, he would move into a tie with LeSean McCoy for 12th place and with four would take sole possession of 12th.
- Kamara will play is expected to play in his 105th career regular season game on Sunday and move into a tie for 48th on the club's all-time list for games played with RB Pierre Thomas and DL Willie Whitehead.
- Kamara has 4,351 career receiving yards, ranked 19th in NFL record books among running backs. With 107 receiving yards, he would move into a tie with Thurman Thomas (Pro Football Hall of Fame Class of 2007) for 18th and with 108, would take sole possion of 18th..
- In Saints club records, Kamara's 4,351 career receiving yards rank eighth. With 27 receiving yards, he would move into seventh place past WR Devery Henderson.
- Kamara's 24 career receiving touchdowns are ranked 11th in club record books. With one touchdown grab, he would move into a tie for ninth with former Black and Gold WRs Quinn Early and Robert Meachem and with two, he would move into sole possession of ninth.
- Kamara's 24 career receiving touchdowns are tied for 19th all-time among NFL running backs with Clem Daniels and Ronnie Harmon. With one, he would move into a tie for 18th with James White and with two, he would move into a tie for 16th with Tim Brown and Larry Gannon.
- Kamara is tied with Pro Football Hall of Fame RB Jim Brown for fifth all-time with 11 games with both a rushing and receiving touchdown. A performance with a rushing and receiving touchdown would move Kamara into a tie for third with both RB Brian Westbrook and Pro Football Hall of Fame flanker/halfback Lenny Moore (Class of 1975).
- Kamara's seven career two-point conversions are tied for first place in NFL record books with Pro Football Hall of Fame RB Marshall Faulk (Class of 2011). With his next two-point conversion, Kamara would become the league's all-time recordholder.
- CB **Marshon Lattimore's** 15 career interceptions are tied for eighth place in club record books with S Brett Maxie, S Marcus Williams and DB Ernie Jackson. With one interception, he would move into a tie for seventh place with CB Toi Cook and with two, he would move into a tie for sixth place with CB Johnnie Poe.
- S **Tyrann Mathieu** is tied for first among active players with 35 career interceptions with Minnesota Vikings S Harrison Smith. With one pick on Sunday, he would potentially surpass Smith and become the NFL's active leader (note-Smith and the Vikings play at 12 p.m. also).
- C/G **Lucas Patrick** will play in his 100th career game on Sunday.
- WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed** has 592 career punt return yards, ranked tenth in club record books. With eight punt return yards, Shaheed would surpass Eric Guliford into ninth place, with 19, he would surpass Rich Mauti and move into eighth and with 66 he would surpass Mel Gray and move into seventh.
- CB **Alontae Taylor's** team-leading 3.5 interceptions are the second-highest total by a Saints cornerback behind Alex Molden's four in 1997. With a split sack, Taylor will tie Molden's mark for Saints corners and with a whole takedown, he would surpass it.
- LS **Zach Wood** will play in his 119th career game on Sunday and will surpass former Saints S Brett Maxie and DE Charles Grant for sole possession of 33rd place on the club's all-time list..

TEAM NOTES

EVANS SELECTED TO SAINTS RING OF HONOR

Former Saints G Jahri Evans will be inducted into the club's Ring of Honor during a halftime ceremony of the team's contest against the Cleveland Browns on November 17.

Evans, 6-4, 318, was originally a fourth round draft pick (108th overall) of the Saints in 2006 out of Bloomsburg and developed into an anchor for one of the most dominant offenses in NFL history during his tenure with the Saints. The Philadelphia, Pa. native started all 169 regular season games he played in at right guard and all of the team's ten postseason contests during that period, including all three during the 2009 campaign when the Saints captured Super Bowl XLIV.

A five-time Associated Press All-Pro (2009-13), Evans was selected first-team four times, twice as much as any other Saint. Evans was selected to six straight Pro Bowls (2009-14) and was named to the Pro Football Hall of Fame's 2010's All-Decade Team. During his 11-year tenure, the Saints were ranked first in the NFL in total offense (net yards per game) six times (2006, 2008-09, 2011, 2014 and 2016) and in scoring (points per game) twice (2008-09). The 274 sacks surrendered by the Saints offensive line from 2006-16 were the lowest total in the NFL over the period and the unit was recognized twice (2009 and 2011) as the winner of the Madden Pro-tector Offensive Line Award.

Evans closed out his playing career starting 14 games at right guard for the Green Bay Packers in 2017, finishing with 183 total games played/started. A Pro Football Hall of Fame semifinalist in 2023 and finalist in 2024, Evans began his coaching career as an offensive assistant for the Saints in 2023.

Vice President/Asst. General Manager-College Personnel Jeff Ireland - Stepson of Chiefs Hall of Fame linebacker/center E.J. Holub. Grandson of Philadelphia Eagles running back and Chicago Bears personnel executive Jim Parmer.

National Scout Terry Wooden - Brother, Jojo is Senior Director of Player Personnel for the Las Vegas Raiders.

QB Derek Carr - Older brother, David was the No. 1 overall pick in the 2002 NFL Draft by the Houston Texans and played quarterback in the league for 11 seasons with Houston, Carolina, the New York Giants and San Francisco. Uncle, Lon Boyett, played tight end for Tampa Bay, the Raiders and San Francisco.

LB Demario Davis - Cousin of the late Steve McNair, the standout quarterback for the Tennessee Titans [1995-2005] and Baltimore Ravens [2006-07].

QB Taysom Hill - Brother-in-law, David Nixon, played linebacker and on special teams for the Oakland Raiders [2009], Houston Texans [2010] and St. Louis Rams [2010-11].

DB Jordan Howden - Cousin, Saladin Martin, played cornerback with the New York Jets [1980] and San Francisco 49ers [1981].

TE Juwan Johnson - Brother, George, played defensive end for eight years in the NFL with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, Minnesota Vikings, Detroit Lions and Saints.

DE Cameron Jordan - Father, Steve, had a prolific 13-year career at tight end for the Minnesota Vikings, with six Pro Bowl selections, being inducted into their Ring of Honor.

C/G Erik McCoy - Cousin of former Dolphins and Buccaneers running back Jorvorski Lane.

LB Nephi Sewell - One brother Penei, is a member of the Detroit Lions after getting selected seventh overall in the 2021 NFL Draft. Another brother, Noah, was selected by the Chicago Bears in the fifth round of the 2023 NFL Draft.

Practice Squad WR Equanimeous St. Brown - Younger brother, Amon-Ra plays wide receiver for the Lions.

LB Pete Werner - Father, Greg, played nine games at right end and on special teams for the New York Jets in 1989 and went to training camp with the Philadelphia Eagles in 1990.

WR Cedrick Wilson Jr. - Father, Cedrick Sr., is a former NFL wideout, who played for seven years in the league, including a Super Bowl championship with the Pittsburgh Steelers.

Area Scout Joey Vitt - Father, Joe Vitt, is a longtime NFL assistant coach, who served as assistant head coach/linebackers of the Saints from 2006-16 and also had coaching stints with the Seattle Seahawks, Colts, Los Angeles/St. Louis Rams, Kansas City Chiefs and Jets.

Area Scout Matt Phillips - Father, Ted, worked in the Chicago Bears front office from 1983-2022, including serving his last 24 years as team president.

ROSTER ROLL CALL

On the Saints active roster as of September 2, 36 were on the active roster, a reserve list of the practice squad at the end of the 2023 season. Among newcomers, the roster includes nine unrestricted free agents, one trade acquisition, six draft picks, four rookie free agents.

Of the players, 24 have less than four years of previous NFL experience, including ten rookies. The following is a breakdown of New Orleans' roster by years of experience (year entering): 14 years - 1, 13 years - 1, 12 years - 1, 11 years - 1, 8 years - 6, 7 years - 3, 6 years - 6, 5 years - 4, 4 years - 5, 3 years - 5, 2 years - 7, 1 year - 2, rookies - 10.

HIGHER EDUCATION

40 colleges and universities are represented on the Saints' 53-man roster. Of that total, eight are represented by multiple Saints, four from Ohio State, three from Fresno State and two from BYU, Mississippi State, LSU, Notre Dame, Tennessee, Northern Iowa, South Carolina and Vanderbilt.

TURNOVER RATIO LEADER

After finishing 31st in the NFL at -11 in 2022, New Orleans finished the 2023 season tied for third in turnover differential at +11 and ranked second in the NFC. The Saints won the turnover battle in eight games in 2023 and posted a 6-2 record in those contests. In 2024, they are tied for third at +4 through the first three games, while winning the battle in each contest, including having one interception and one fumble recovery on Sunday.

BUCKING THE ODDS

The Saints have a long tradition of finding players as free agents signed after the draft that make an impact immediately or after developing their careers initially on the practice squad. Several undrafted Saints on the roster play key roles on offense, defense and special teams, including four undrafted rookies who are on the 53-man roster out of the preseason.

Over the past 21 years, the Saints (2018-22: DB **J.T. Gray**, WR/RS **Deonte Harty** and WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed**) and San Diego/Los Angeles Chargers (2003: G **Kris Dielman**, TE **Antonio Gates** and WR **Kasim Osgood**) are the only two teams to have three players signed as undrafted free agents be selected to a Pro Bowl for the team that originally signed them.

In 2023, Shaheed was no longer a secret around the National Football League, as he appeared in 15 games with six starts and caught 46 passes for 719 yards (club-best 15.6 avg.) with five touchdown grabs to tie for the team lead, including seven receptions of 40-or-more yards, while also carrying seven times for 37 yards and ranking second in the NFC and third in the NFL in punt return average (13.6) and tenth in the league in all-purpose yards (1,479), despite missing two contests with a quad injury. Tying for the team lead with six total touchdowns including a punt return touchdown, Shaheed was selected as both Pro Bowl starter as a return specialist and as a first-team *Associated Press* All-Pro as a punt returner.

An integral part of both the team’s offense and return game, Shaheed and the Saints agreed to a contract extension prior to the start of training camp. Through three games, Shaheed has seven receptions for 169 yards (24.1 avg.) with touchdowns of 59- and 70 yards, carried three times for 13 yards, returned four punts for 60 yards and one kickoff for 33 yards. Rasheed’s 15.0 punt return average ranks second in the NFL, his 275 all-purpose yards rank third and his 24.1 yards per catch average rank fourth. Overall, since coming into the league in 2022, his 13 catches of 40 yards or more rank second in the NFL.

Originally signed as an undrafted free agent in 2018, spending part of his rookie season on the practice squad, Gray’s 71 special teams tackles since 2019 rank first in the National Football League, as he has been selected as both an *Associated Press* first-team All-Pro and Pro Bowler. In 2023, the special teams captain finished the season with 11 coverage stops to lead the team and tie for 12th in the league, despite missing three contests with injuries. In 2024, he is tied for second on the team with six stops and had a blocked punt on Sunday vs. Philadelphia.

TE **Juwan Johnson** first led Saints tight ends with four touchdown receptions in 2021, converting to the position that offseason after playing wideout in college and as a rookie in 2020, signed as an undrafted free agent from Oregon. In 2022, he led the Black and Gold tight ends in receiving with 42 grabs for 508 yards with a club-best and career-high seven touchdowns, tied for third at the position in the NFL. Johnson led the team’s tight ends with 37 grabs for 368 yards with four touchdown grabs in 2023. Johnson has led the Saints with 12 receiving touchdowns over the past three seasons, ranked fourth over that period among league tight ends.

DE **Carl Granderson** joined the club in 2019 as an undrafted free agent out of Wyoming and has appeared in 74 regular season games with 27 starts, posting 193 tackles (122 solo), 26 sacks for a loss of 166.5 yards, two passes defended, four forced fumbles and two recoveries. In 2023, Granderson earned the starting right end position and posted a career-high 78 tackles (44 solo), led the team with a career-best 8.5 sacks for a loss of 55 yards, defended one pass and forced a fumble and recovered one. Granderson’s 78 stops ranked fifth in the National Football League among defensive linemen and were the most by a Saints lineman since 2004.

After originally signing as an undrafted free agent out of Vanderbilt in 2023, where he led the Commodores in tackles in each of his final three seasons, LB **Anfernee Orji** received the opportunity to see extensive snaps in practice in training camp due to injuries to teammates Demario Davis and Pete Werner. He leads the team with seven coverage stops and has also added one defensive tackle.

After originally signed as an undrafted free agent out of Utah in 2022, LB **Nephi Sewell** has become a valued member of the special teams units in his first two seasons, while also providing depth on defense. In his first full season in 2023 on the active roster, Sewell totaled five coverage stops and one forced fumble on special teams and ten defensive tackles. Sewell is currently on Reserve/Physically Unable to Perform, recovering from a knee injury suffered in Week 17 of the 2023 campaign.

TE **Dallin Holker** was signed by New Orleans after a standout graduate transfer campaign at Colorado State, where he posted 64 receptions for 767 yards with six touchdowns, the highest total of yardage and scoring grabs in the college regular season by an FBS tight end. Holker’s performance in the off-season and training camp secured a roster spot behind Johnson, Taysom Hill and Foster Moreau.

New Orleans signed P **Matthew Hayball** out of Vanderbilt following the NFL Draft. The West Adelaide, Australia native finished as Vandy’s all-time leader in punting average (46.5) and was a consensus second-team All-American in 2023, when he ranked seventh nationally in net (43.1). Hayball won a training camp competition to secure the job. In the first three games, he has punted seven times with a 39.7 net punting average.

CB **Rico Payton** signed a college free agent contract in the spring, playing his final four years at Pittsburg State. As a senior in 2023, the St. Louis native recorded 35 tackles with four interceptions and 15 passes defensed. Payton secured a roster spot with his performance in training camp practices and preseason games, leading the team with five passes defensed and adding seven defensive tackles and one coverage stop in three contests. Payton has contributed on both defense and special teams in the first three games with one pass breakup and one coverage stop.

WR **Mason Tipton** stuck on the training camp roster after showing bright spots in training camp practices, following a college career at Yale, where he posted 132 receptions for 1,067 yards with 19 TDs.

In 2023, rookie free agent kicker **Blake Grupe** won placekicking duties in training camp and made significant contributions to the team's highly-ranked special teams units.



Grupe was signed as a free agent out of Notre Dame, where he played his graduate campaign in 2022, after handling kicking duties at Arkansas State from 2017-21. In 17 games, Grupe made 30 of 37 field goal attempts and all 40 PAT attempts to lead the team with 130 points. In the Sept. 8 season-opening win over Carolina, Grupe had a career-high 17 points, drilling all four field goal attempts, including a first quarter 57-yard kick.

QUARTERBACKS

DEREK CARR



On March 6, 2023, the Saints agreed to terms with Derek Carr on a four-year contract to solidify the quarterback position. He spent the first nine seasons of his NFL career with the Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders. Originally selected in the second round [36th overall] of the 2014 NFL Draft by the Raiders out of Fresno State, the Bakersfield, Calif. native has started all 162 career regular season games he has played in, the most starts at the position over that time, completing 3,620-of-5,570 passes [65.0 pct.] for 39,685 yards with 248 touchdown passes, 109 interceptions and a 92.6 passer rating, while adding 902 rushing yards and seven touchdowns. Since entering the league in 2014, Carr ranks first in the NFL in completions, second in passing yardage and sixth in passing touchdowns. He became the third quarterback in NFL history to pass for 3,000-plus yards in each of his first ten seasons, joining Pro Football Hall of Fame signal-caller Peyton Manning and Russell Wilson. He is just the fourth player in NFL history to reach 35,000 passing yards in his first nine seasons and has completed 312 passes of 25+ yards since he entered the league in 2014, second-most in the NFL over that span.

Carr started all 17 games in 2023 and completed 375-of-548 passes [68.4 pct.] for 3,878 yards with 25 touchdowns, eight interceptions and a 97.7 passer rating. He finished his first season in Black and Gold ranked second in the NFL in fourth quarter passer rating [106.9], sixth in completion percentage, seventh in completions and tenth in TD passes and passer rating.

In 2024, Carr has completed 44-of-64 passes [68.8 pct.] for 585 yards, six touchdowns, only two interceptions and a 115.7 passer rating. Carr ranks first in the NFL in yards per attempt [9.14], second touchdown percentage [9.4], is tied for second in touchdown passes and ranked third in passer rating, leading New Orleans to a 2-1 start.

RUNNING BACKS

ALVIN KAMARA

A talented runner and receiver who was selected by the Saints in the third round of the 2017 NFL Draft out of the University of Tennessee, Kamara enjoyed an outstanding rookie campaign. He ranked first on the club and sixth in the NFL in yards from scrimmage (1,554), second on the team in rushing and receiving, carrying 120 times for 728 yards (6.1 avg) with eight TDs and a two-point conversion, catching 81 passes for 826 yards (10.2 avg) with five touchdowns and one kickoff return for a touchdown in the regular season finale. Kamara set a club rookie record with 14 total scores, tied for second in the NFL and finished first in the league in yards per carry.

Kamara was the first Saints offensive rookie selected to the Pro Bowl since Rueben Mayes (1986), as an *Associated Press* second team All-Pro (flex), the club's first rookie All-Pro since 1993. He was also named *The Sporting News* NFL Rookie of the Year and AP NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year.

Kamara is off to a spectacular start through the first three games of the 2024 season, carrying 61 times for 285 yards (4.7 avg.) with four touchdowns and catching ten passes for 132 yards (13.1 avg.) with a career-long 57-yard touchdown. With a nose for the end zone, he is ranked first in the NFL in total yards from scrimmage (417), tied for first in total touchdowns and rushing touchdowns and ranked fourth in rushing.

In the Sept. 15 win at Dallas, Kamara had 180 total yards from scrimmage, including 115 rushing and four touchdowns, three on the ground to earn NFC Offensive Player of the Week honors.

In 104 career regular season games with 73 starts, Kamara has carried 1,376 times for 6,114 yards (4.4 avg.) with 58 touchdowns and has caught 515 passes for 4,351 yards (8.4 avg.) with 24 touchdowns. Kamara is the franchise's all-time leader in rushing touchdowns, total touchdowns (83), total yards from scrimmage (10,465) and all-purpose yardage (11,123) and is ranked second in rushing yards.

SCRIMMAGE LEADER

Since entering the NFL in 2017, Kamara ranks third in the league in total yards from scrimmage (10,465), only one of four players to have 10,000 over that period. Kamara (2017-22) became the first NFL Player since Julio Jones (2014-19) to have six consecutive seasons of at least 1,300 total yards from scrimmage. The 10,465 total yards from scrimmage ranks tenth among active players.

In the Saints' 2020 Christmas 52-33 win over the Vikings, Kamara tied the National Football League record for total touchdowns (6) and rushing touchdowns (6), as he carried 22 times for a career-high 155 yards (7.0 avg.), adding three receptions for 17 yards for 172 yards from scrimmage. After Kamara's two-touchdown performance in the Week Five win over Washington, Kamara's 19 career games with at least two touchdowns are tied with four players for the third-most such games by a player in his first five seasons in NFL history. JAMAAL WILLIAMS

This seven-year NFL veteran was signed by the New Orleans Saints as an unrestricted free agent in the 2023 offseason. In eight NFL seasons with Green Bay [2017-20], Detroit [2021-22] and New Orleans [2023-], Williams has played in 106 games with 44 starts, carrying 1,041 times for 4,034 yards with 32 touchdowns, also catching 180 passes for 1,266 yards with eight touchdowns for 5,300 total yards from scrimmage. Williams is part of a formidable rushing trio with Kamara and his former college teammate, Taysom Hill.

JORDAN MIMS

A former standout at Fresno State, where he rushed for 3,285 yards and 37 TDs, Mims joined the Saints practice squad after going to training camp with Buffalo and contributed on special teams in two games for the Black and Gold in 2023. 6-0, 205, Mims will contribute in the run game and on special teams after earning a roster spot and had his first coverage tackle Sunday vs. Philadelphia..

WIDE RECEIVERS

CHRIS OLAVE

The 11th overall pick in the 2022 NFL Draft out of Ohio State, this talented wideout made an immediate impact as a rookie, catching 72 passes for 1,042 yards [14.5 avg.] and four TDs, leading the team in receptions, receiving average and receiving yards, while earning September NFL Offensive Rookie of the Month honors as the 24th player since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger to record 1,000 receiving yards as a rookie. Olave became the third Saints rookie to reach 1,000 receiving yards and the first Saints rookie since WR Danny Abramowicz [1967] to lead the team in receiving, receiving yardage and yards per catch in his first campaign.

In 2023, Olave took the next step in his career, leading the team in receiving and receiving yardage for the second consecutive season with 87 receptions for 1,123 yards and five touchdowns, tying for the team lead. The Southern California native became the seventh Saint with 85 receptions in a season and the sixth Saints with 1,100 receiving yards in a single season. His 87 grabs were the 11th highest single-season total in franchise history and the yardage total ranks 16th. He reached the 100-yard receiving mark in five contests.

BY THE NUMBERS

This third-year wideout has made his mark for New Orleans in both the passing game and the return game, where he was selected to the Pro Bowl and voted as an AP All-Pro in 2023. In addition to the return duties in 2023, Shaheed enjoyed a breakout season on offense, when he recorded 46 receptions for 719 yards (15.6 avg.) with five touchdown grabs, finishing 12th in the NFL in yards per catch.

Enjoying a breakout campaign, Shaheed has recorded seven receptions for 169 yards (24.1 avg.) with two touchdowns, carried three times for 13 yards, brought back four punts for 60 yards (15.0 avg.) and returned a kickoff 33 yards.

A.T. PERRY

New Orleans selected this big-bodied, sure-handed target in the sixth round of the 2023 NFL Draft out of Wake Forest. At 6-5, 205, the South Florida native possesses the ability to make the tough catch in traffic. During his college career, Perry set numerous Wake Forest receiving records, including a program-best 28 touchdowns. In his last two seasons, he became the first player in Demon Deacons history to have multiple 1,000-yard receiving seasons and shattered the single-season touchdown grab mark with 15 in 2021.

Perry moved into the wide receiver rotation at mid-season and in the last eight contests of the 2023 season, recorded 12 grabs for 246 yards (20.5 avg.) with four touchdowns, including two scoring receptions in the season finale victory over Atlanta.

GEDRICK WILSON JR.

This seventh-year wideout was signed by New Orleans to a two-year contract at the start of free agency to compete for snaps on offense and to provide veteran leadership to the wideout room. In 71 regular season games with seven starts, he has recorded 102 receptions for 1,272 yards with 11 touchdowns. In 2023, the Memphis native posted 22 catches for 296 yards with three touchdowns, adding three grabs for 37 yards in the postseason.

TIGHT ENDS

TAYSOM HILL

Hill has brought unheralded versatility to the Saints offense and special teams. A participant on special teams since midseason in 2017, as well as a signal-caller and as a runner and receiver, Hill has played in 99 regular season games with 43 starts at several positions. He has carried 406 times for 2,212 yards, the most by a Saint not to play running back, with 27 touchdowns, tied for seventh in club records. In the passing game, he has caught 78 passes for 758 yards with 11 touchdowns, completed 191-of-298 passes (64.1 pct.) for 2,348 yards with 11 touchdowns, returned 19 kickoffs for 447 yards, made 15 special teams tackles and blocked one punt.

In 2023, Hill ranked second on the team in rushing with 81 carries for 401 yards (5.0 avg.) with four touchdowns, caught a career-high 33 passes for 291 yards with two TDs, completed six-of-11 passes for 83 yards with one TD and a 109.3 passer rating, returned a kickoff 18 yards and had two special teams tackles.

RENAISSANCE MAN

Hill turned in an all-around standout performance in the November 5, 2023 win over the Chicago Bears, where he led the team in rushing, carrying 11 times for 52 yards (4.7 avg.), completed a three-yard touchdown pass to tight end Juwan Johnson and caught four passes for 13 yards with one touchdown.



BY THE NUMBERS

1 - With 2,212 rushing yards, 2,348 passing yards and 758 receiving yards, Hill is the only NFL player in the Super Bowl era with 2,000 career passing yards, 2,000 career rushing yards and 700 career receiving yards.

27 - Hill's 27 career rushing touchdowns are tied for seventh in club record books. With one more rushing touchdown, he would move into a tie for fifth place with RBs Chuck Muncie and Pierre Thomas.

33 - Hill's 33 receptions in 2023 set a career-high.

38 - Hill has 38 career touchdowns, ranked 11th in club record books. With two more touchdowns, he would move into the top ten.

47 - Hill brought back his first career NFL kickoff return 47 yards in a 21-18 win over the Cleveland Browns on Sept. 16, 2018, the longest of his career. In part-time kickoff return duty, he has brought back 19 kicks for 447 yards (23.5 avg.).

575 - Hill's 575 rushing yards in 2022, is the highest rushing yardage total by a Saint whose primary position is not running back. In fact, Hill has the four biggest single-season non-running back rushing yardage totals.

5,765 - Hill has accounted a total of 5,765 total yards in his seven-year NFL career (2,348 passing, 758 receiving, 2,212 rushing and 447 kickoff returns).

JUWAN JOHNSON

The former Penn State and Oregon wideout joined the New Orleans Saints in 2020 following the NFL Draft and transitioned to tight end his second season in 2021. In 2022, the New Jersey native had a breakout campaign as he appeared in 16 games with 12 starts and finished with 42 receptions for 508 yards and a team-best seven touchdown grabs. Johnson was tied for third among National Football League tight ends in receiving touchdowns. Overall, Johnson’s 15 touchdown grabs since 2021 lead the team.

In 13 games with 11 starts in 2023, Johnson finished with 37 receptions for 368 yards and four touchdowns to lead the position group in all major receiving categories. In his final four contests of the season, three of which were Saints victories, Johnson had 17 grabs for 206 yards and three touchdowns.

BIG TARGET

Johnson’s 12 touchdown grabs since 2022 are ranked fourth among NFL tight ends following his 16-yard scoring grab in the season opener.

FOSTER MOREAU

This veteran tight end and New Orleans native finished his fifth NFL season and first with the Black and Gold after spending his first four campaigns with the Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders. In his career, Moreau has appeared in 79 regular season games with 47 starts and has recorded 117 receptions for 1,345 yards (11.5 avg.) with 14 TDs, also adding seven special teams tackles.

After dealing with a nagging ankle injury in his first season in New Orleans, in the Sept. 8 season-opening victory over Carolina, Moreau led the team’s tight ends in receiving with four receptions for 43 yards with one touchdown.

OFFENSIVE LINE

ERIK MCCOY

New Orleans traded up in the second round of the 2019 NFL Draft to select this standout from Texas A&M, who was a three-year starter, anchoring the middle of the Aggies line. In 2019, the East Texas native was the first Saint in franchise history to start at center in Week One, opening all 16 contests. McCoy has opened all 77 contests he has appeared in at center and signed a five-year contract extension with the team in 2022. Selected as a team captain for the first time in 2023, McCoy was the only Saints offensive lineman to open all 17 games and was named to his first Pro Bowl. The Saints will lean heavily on McCoy’s leadership in 2024 as the offensive line opened the season with three new starters.

GESAR RUIZ

The hard-working, talented and intelligent lineman embodies New Orleans’ culture. Ruiz was selected with the 24th overall pick in the 2020 NFL Draft out of Michigan. The three-year letterman played in 36 games in college, starting his last 31, including the final 26 at center. As a rookie, Ruiz settled in at right guard in the last 15 games with nine starts, as well as both postseason contests. When McCoy suffered a lower leg injury in the first quarter of the 2021 season-opening win over Green Bay, Ruiz transitioned over to center, where the Saints did not give up a sack in his four starts and was the only lineman in 2021 to start every game. In 2023, he rebounded from a lis franc injury in 2022 to open 16 contests at right guard.

DEFENSIVE LINE

CAMERON JORDAN

New Orleans' first choice in the 2011 NFL Draft [24th overall] out of the University of California, Jordan has played in 212 career regular season games with 211 starts, recording 778 tackles (480 solo), a franchise record 117.5 sacks for a loss of 779.5 yards, two interceptions, 64 pass breakups, 15 forced fumbles and 11 fumble recoveries. In 2023, despite a lingering ankle injury, Jordan started every contest and recorded 43 tackles (20 solo), two sacks, three pass breakups and one fumble recovery.

On Dec. 24, 2022, at Cleveland, Jordan played in his 200th career game [regular season/postseason combined] in a Black and Gold uniform, moving him into third place on the club's all-time games played list. The following week at Philadelphia, Jan. 1, 2023, Jordan also started his 200th career game, joining Drew Brees as only the second player to open 200 contests in franchise history. On Sept. 24, 2023, at Green Bay, Jordan played in his 206th career game, passing Thomas Morstead for second all-time in club record books. On Oct. 29, 2023, Jordan became only the second Saints player, first defensive Saint and 57th NFL defensive lineman to play in 200 regular season contests. On Nov. 5, 2023 vs. Chicago, he became only the second Saint to start 200 career regular season contests. 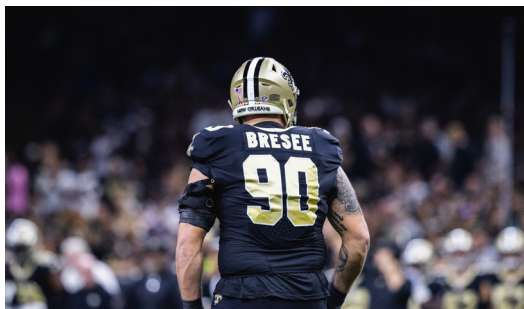

SAINTS AT FALCONS

BRYAN BRESEE

The team's first round selection in the 2023 NFL Draft out of Clemson after being a three-time All-ACC selection, the Maryland native played in 26 games with 21 starts for the Tigers, producing 54 tackles [35 solo], 15 stops for loss, nine sacks, a forced fumble, an interception and five passes defended.

Bresee immediately found a role in New Orleans' interior rotation and appeared in all 17 games, recording 24 tackles, 4.5 sacks and six pass breakups. His takedown total was the highest by a Saints rookie defensive tackle since becoming an official statistic in 1982 and his pass defense total was the most in club records for a rookie at the position since the statistic was officially recorded in 1980, Bresee also tied for second in the league among defensive tackles in 2023.

Bresee is enjoying a breakout sophomore campaign, starting all three games and tying for the NFL lead among defensive tackles with three sacks.

CARL GRANDERSON

Signed by New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Wyoming in 2019, Granderson posted 17.5 sacks in college and possesses the prototypical frame for an NFL pass rusher. Granderson has become a significant cog in the team's defensive line rotation with 192 tackles, 26 sacks, two pass breakups, four forced fumbles and two recoveries.

Earning the starting right defensive end position in 2023, Granderson posted a career-high 78 tackles [44 solo], led the team with a career-best 8.5 sacks for a 55-yard loss, one pass defense, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery. Through three games in 2024, Granderson has 13 tackles, three sacks and one forced fumble, recording 1.5 take-downs in the last two contests.

TACKLES UP FRONT

Granderson's 78 tackles in 2023 ranked fifth in the National Football League among defensive linemen and were the most by a Saints defensive lineman since 2004.

PAYTON TURNER

With the 28th overall pick in the 2021 NFL Draft out of Houston, the Saints added to the defensive line with this gifted pass rusher. In 18 career games, Turner has recorded 29 tackles, three sacks, one pass breakup one fumble recovery, one special teams stop and one blocked field goal. In 2023, the Texan suffered a toe injury in the season-opening win over Tennessee that would sideline him for 15 contests. However, Turner returned for the season finale vs. Atlanta and recorded the first fumble recovery of his career, showing his promise both with his pass rush and playmaking abilities. Turner is part of the team's defensive line rotation and also contributes on special teams, recording his first career coverage stop on Sunday vs. Philadelphia.

CHASE YOUNG

Originally selected by Washington with the second overall pick in the 2020 NFL Draft out of Ohio State, this talented edge rusher is in his fifth season in the NFL and first with New Orleans. In five campaigns for Washington [2020-23], San Francisco [2023] and New Orleans [2024], Young has appeared in 46 regular season games with 32 starts and recorded 104 tackles [68 solo], 16.5 sacks, 20 stops for loss, nine pass breakups, six forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries. The consensus NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year, Young recorded 44 tackles, 7.5 sacks, ten stops for loss and made multiple splash plays with four forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries in 2020. Young played in only 12 games from 2021-22 after suffering a knee injury midway through his second campaign. In 2023, he played in seven games for Washington and nine for San Francisco following a midseason trade and tied his career-best with 7.5 takedowns in helping the 49ers advance to Super Bowl LVIII. Young has fit in with the New Orleans defensive line and his addition will be a boost to the front.

NATHAN SHEPHERD

Originally selected by the New York Jets in the third round of the 2018 NFL Draft out of Fort Hays State, this versatile defensive tackle enters his seventh NFL season, his second campaign with the Saints. The Ajax, Ontario, Canada native has appeared in 93 career games with 32 starts, totaling 171 tackles [90 solo] and nine sacks for a loss of 75 yards. In 2023, this valued free agent acquisition started all 17 games for New Orleans in the middle, posting career-highs in tackles [50], solo stops [26] and sacks [three].

KHALEN SAUNDERS

Originally selected by the Kansas City Chiefs in the third round of the 2019 NFL Draft out of Western Illinois, Saunders enters his sixth NFL season and second campaign with New Orleans. Signed as an unrestricted free agent in the 2023 offseason, Saunders combined with two other newcomers in Shepherd and Bresee to form a new interior front, recording career-highs in tackles [57] and solo stops [24]. In 55 career regular season games with 22 starts, Saunders has recorded 138 tackles [64 solo], 4.5 sacks, three pass breakups and four stops for loss.

LINEBACKERS



DEMARIO DAVIS

This dependable and sure-tackling defender joined the New Orleans Saints in 2018 after spending his first six NFL seasons with the New York Jets and Cleveland Browns. In his career, the Brandon, Miss. native has appeared in 197 regular season games with 183 starts for the Jets [2012-15, 2017], Browns [2016] and the Saints [2018-], recording 1,353 stops [869 solo], 43.5 sacks, three interceptions, 55 pass breakups, four forced fumbles, eight fumble recoveries and 24 special teams tackles.

In 2023, Davis started every contest and again led the Black and Gold in tackles with 121 stops [74 solo], ranked second with 6.5 sacks and added one forced fumble, one fumble recovery and four pass breakups. He joined LB Joe Federspiel as only the second Saint to have 100 stops in six straight seasons, having done so in his last seven campaigns and his tenth season overall of his 12-year National Football League career.

PETE WERNER



New Orleans selected this three-year starter from Ohio State in the second round of the 2021 NFL Draft. The Indianapolis native finished his college career playing in 47 career games with 35 starts, recording 185 tackles (111 solo), 16 stops for loss, four sacks, 11 pass breakups, four forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Werner helped power the Buckeyes to the College Football Playoff championship game as a senior in 2020, when he was voted by the Big Ten coaches as a first-team All-Conference selection and a Butkus Award semi-finalist, posting 54 tackles, 2.5 stops for loss, one sack and two forced fumbles.

In four seasons, Werner has played in 46 games with 38 starts and has recorded 246 tackles (160 solo), a split sack, one interception, four pass breakups, two forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and three special teams stops.

Werner finished the 2023 season ranked second on the team with 93 stops, a split sack, one interception, one pass breakup and two fumble recoveries, tied for the team lead. In the second week of 2024 training camp, he agreed to terms with the Saints on a three-year contract extension.

WILLIE GAY JR.



A contributor on defense for the back-to-back Super Bowl Champion Kansas City Chiefs, this sideline to sideline linebacker joined the Saints at the start of the 2024 free agency period. In five seasons, Gay has played in 60 regular season games with 49 starts, posting 235 tackles (152 solo), five sacks, four interceptions, including one returned for a touchdown, 19 pass breakups, two forced fumbles, five fumble recoveries and seven special teams stops. In nine postseason games played/starts, Gay has accumulated 29 stops, a split sack and three passes defended.

In his final season in Kansas City, Gay played in 16 regular season games with 15 starts for the Chiefs and finished the season with 58 tackles (44 solo), one sack, one interception, four pass breakups, one forced fumble and a career-high three fumble recoveries. In three postseason starts en route to the Super Bowl Championship, Gay collected nine more stops and one pass defense.

ANFERNEE ORJI

After originally signed as an undrafted free agent out of Vanderbilt in 2023, where he led the Commodores in tackles in each of his final three seasons, Orji spent his entire rookie season on the club's practice squad. He received the opportunity to see extensive snaps in practice in training camp due to injuries to teammates Davis and Werner. In three preseason contests, Orji led the team with 20 tackles (team-high 13 solo), one stop for loss, two passes defended and three special teams stops, securing a 53-man roster spot. The Saints will look to utilize Orji's speed and physicality for contributions both on defense and the team's coverage units in 2024. He leads the team with seven special teams tackles and has added one defensive stop.

SECONDARY

S TYRANN MATHIEU

This versatile, hard-hitting, playmaking safety and New Orleans native enters his third season with his hometown team, signing after the 2022 NFL Draft. Mathieu has brought experience and leadership to the Saints secondary. He was originally selected by the Arizona Cardinals in the third round (69th overall) in the 2013 NFL Draft out of LSU and has played for the Cardinals (2013-17), Houston Texans (2018), Kansas City Chiefs (2019-21) and Saints (2022-). In 11 NFL seasons, he has played in 166 regular season games with 157 starts and has posted career totals of 786 tackles (648 solo), 43 stops for loss, 11 sacks for a loss of 78 yards, 35 interceptions for 524 return yards, four brought back for touchdowns, 101 passes defended, six forced fumbles, eight fumble recoveries and five special teams stops. Mathieu has been selected to three Pro Bowls, three Associated Press All-Pro teams and the Pro Football Hall of Fame's 2010's All-Decade Team.

In his second season in New Orleans in 2023, Mathieu opened all 17 contests for the second consecutive campaign and finished with 75 tackles (50 solo), four interceptions, tied for seventh in the NFL and the team lead, returned for 122 yards with a TD and nine passes defended.

THE ONLY ONE

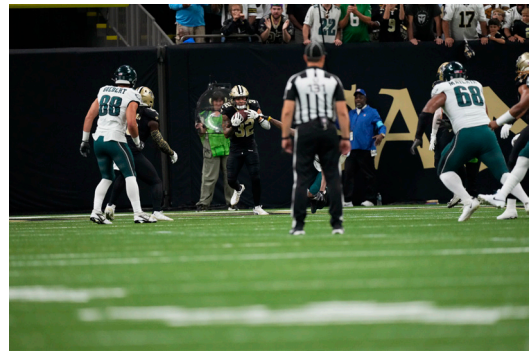
In 2024, Mathieu is his usual playmaking self, as the only player in the National Football League with an interceptions, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery. Through the first three games, he has posted 14 solo tackles, two interceptions, three pass breakups, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery. Mathieu is tied for first in the NFL in takeaways (three) and tied for second in interceptions.

FOUR IN A ROW

Dating back to an interception in the 2023 season finale vs. Atlanta, recovering a fumble in the 2024 season opener vs. Carolina picking off Dallas Cowboys quarterback Dak Prescott and Philadelphia Eagles signal-caller Jalen Hurts the last two weeks, Mathieu has recorded a least one takeaway in four consecutive games for the first time in his career. Mathieu is the first Saints defender to record takeaways in four consecutive contests since another New Orleans native, former Black and Gold cornerback Ashley Ambrose recorded a takeaway [four interceptions and one fumble recovery in four straight contests from Sept. 19-Oct. 7, 1999.



NOSE FOR THE BALL

Mathieu's 35 interceptions since coming into the NFL in 2013 are first in the league over the period after tying for the club lead with four picks in 2023 and leading the team with two in 2024. Mathieu's 35 career picks are tied for first among active players, with Vikings S Harrison Smith's.

SAINTS AT FALCONS

CB MARSHON LATTIMORE

Selected by the Saints in the first round [11th overall] of the 2017 NFL Draft Lattimore started all 13 games he appeared in. He totaled 53 tackles [44 solo], a forced fumble, one fumble recovery, five interceptions for 85 yards and 18 passes defended. As a rookie, Lattimore became the youngest Saint [21 years old] ever selected to the Pro Bowl and was voted as the AP NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year.

In his eighth season, Lattimore has started all 92 regular season games he has played in, recording 379 tackles [307 solo], 15 interceptions, 86 passes defended, five forced fumbles and five fumble recoveries, earning Pro Bowl honors in four seasons.

To open the 2023 season, Lattimore came up with a standout performance in the opening win over Tennessee. In addition to his 15th career pick, to move him into a tie for eighth place in club record books in interceptions, he also finished with four passes defended, the third time in his career he has deflected at least four throws in a contest. In a season cut short by an ankle injury, he started the first ten games and posted 48 stops, one pick and eight passes defended. In 2024, he has opened two games and recorded four tackles, assigned to covering the top receiver of opponents.

GET A HAND ON

Lattimore's 86 passes defended since entering the NFL in 2017 are ranked first in the league.

CB PAULSON ADEBO

New Orleans' third round selection [76th overall] in the 2021 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Adebo overcame not playing college football in 2020 to make significant contributions to the Saints secondary in his first season with the club. The Texas native finished his college career playing in 22 games with 21 starts for Stanford and recording 97 tackles, 34 pass breakups and eight interceptions, earning All-Pac 12 honors in both 2018 and 2019.

Joining the starting lineup immediately as a rookie in 2021, Adebo has played in 47 games with 46 starts, posting 208 tackles, eighth interceptions, 36 pass breakups, two forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and two special teams stops.

Sharpened by an extensive training camp competition, Adebo enjoyed a breakout 2023 campaign. His season was highlighted by a two interception, three total takeaway performance in the Nov. 5, 24-17 win over Chicago that earned him NFC Defensive Player of the Week. Adebo finished with 76 tackles to lead the secondary, four interceptions, tied for first on the team with Mathieu, 18 pass breakups to rank third in the league, two forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries, also adding a pick on a two-point attempt in the Dec. 31, 23-13 win at Tampa Bay.

ALONTAE TAYLOR

Selected by the Saints in the second round [49th overall] of the 2022 NFL Draft out of Tennessee, Taylor shook off early injuries to play in 13 games with nine starts and posted 45 tackles [38 solo] and a club-best 11 pass breakups, ranked fourth among NFL rookies.

Moving to the nickel position in 2023, possessing extensive experience on the inside and the outside, Taylor appeared in all 17 games with 13 starts and recorded 75 tackles, his first two career interceptions in the last two weeks of the season and a career-high 14 pass breakups, tied for second on the team and ninth in the NFL.

In 2024, Taylor ranks second on the team with 19 tackles [14 solo], ranks first with 3.5 sacks and has added one pass defense.

DB DROP

In the Sept. 8 season-opening win over Carolina, Taylor became the first Saints defensive back to record three sacks in a contest since the statistic was officially recognized by the NFL in 1982. The only other defensive back to record three sacks on kickoff weekend is former Chargers S Rodney Harrison [vs. Buffalo, 9/6/98]. After splitting a sack on Sunday vs. Philadelphia, Taylor's 3.5 sacks are the second-highest total by a cornerback in Saints record books behind Alex Molden's four in 1997.

BREAKING UP

In 2022, Taylor was the first rookie since Lattimore to lead the Saints in pass breakups [11], and only the fourth in team history to do so [Saints did not track passes defended before 1980]. He followed that up by finishing tied for second on the team with 14 in 2023.

- The Saints were defeated by the Eagles, 15-12 and fall to 2-1 on the season. The Saints will return to action next Sunday, when they play the Atlanta Falcons on Sept. 29 at Mercedes-Benz Stadium. The game will be regionally televised on FOX (WVUE FOX 8 locally) with a noon CT kickoff.
- QB **Derek Carr** finished 14-of-25 for 142 yards with one touchdown and one interception. Carr's passing TD came on a 13-yd pass to **WR Chris Olave** to put the Saints ahead late in the fourth quarter.
- Carr now has 247 career touchdown passes, surpassing Boomer Esiason and moving into a tie with Tony Romo for 25th all-time.
- RB **Alvin Kamara** rushed 26 times for 87 yards to go along with three receptions for 40 yards (13.3 avg).
- With three receptions on Sunday, Kamara moved into a tie for 13th among NFL running backs for receptions with Emmitt Smith (Pro Football Hall of Fame Class of 2010).
- Kamara has 6,113 career rushing yards, ranked second in club records. He officially surpasses Deuce McAllister for second place.
- Kamara played in his 103rd career regular season game, moving into a tie 51st on the club's all-time list for games played with DT Elex Price and DB Malcolm Jenkins.
- Kamara has 4,351 career receiving yards, now ranked 19th in NFL record books among running backs. He surpassed Christian McCaffrey and Warrick Dunn with his receiving yardage performance today.
- Olave finished with six receptions for 86 yards (14.3 avg) including the 13-yard touchdown grab.
- The Saints held Philadelphia scoreless on five straight possessions that extended into Saints territory, an interception by S **Tyrann Mathieu**, a fumble recovery by LB **Willie Gay**, a fourth and one stop at the Saints 15-yard line by LB **Pete Werner** and DE **Chase Young**, a fourth-and-three sack for a loss of six yards by DT **Bryan Bresee** at the Saints 40-yard line and with Philadelphia

punting from the Saints 49-yard line, a blocked punt by DB **J.T. Gray** and recovered by DB **Jordan Howden**.

- CB **Paulson Adebo** led the Saints with a career-high ten solo tackles to go along with a pass breakup.
- S **Tyrann Mathieu** added seven solo tackles, his 35th career interception with one pass breakup. The 35 interceptions are the most in the NFL since 2013, and this was his second straight game with a pick. His 35 career picks tie him with Minnesota Vikings S **Harrison Smith** for the most career interceptions among active players. With a 74-yard interception return in the 2023 season finale vs. Atlanta and a fumble recovery in the season-opening win over Carolina, it is the first time in Mathieu's career he has recorded a takeaway in four consecutive games.
- DE **Bryan Bresee** was a force on the defensive front, tying a career-high with two sacks for a loss of 12 yards.
- DE **Carl Granderson** added five stops (four solo), 1.5 sacks and a forced fumble. With 1.5 sacks last week at Dallas, Granderson has recorded multiple sacks in back-to-back contests for the first time in his career.
- CB **Alontae Taylor** recorded four total stops (two solo) with a half-sack. His 3.5 sacks on the year are the second-highest total by a Saints cornerback to Alex Molden's four in 1997.
- DE **Chase Young** finished with four tackles (one solo) and tied a career-high with three quarterback hits.
- K **Blake Grupe** was two-for-two on field goals against the Eagles, his longest being a 38-yarder.
- P **Matthew Hayball** punted four times for 162 yards (40.5 avg) and pinned Philadelphia inside the 20 twice.
- LS **Zach Wood** played in his 118th career game on Sunday, moving into a tie for 33rd place on the club's all-time list for games played with former Saints S Brett Maxie and DE Charles Grant.

(Opening Statement) “Disappointing loss for us. I don’t think we played as well as we are capable of playing, yet you have to give those guys credit. They beat us today, and we had our opportunities. I don’t think we played, obviously, as well on offense as we had played the first two weeks. Give their defense credit. Defensively, we just gave up too many explosive plays. That was really the key to the game is the explosive plays that we gave up and really kind of our inability to move the ball offensively.”

(On the last explosive play by the Eagles) “We ran into each other. We kind of knew that (Dallas Goedert) was the guy they were going to try to throw the ball to. We had a double on him, and we just ran into each other, creating an explosive play. Yeah, it’s disappointing.”

(On facing QB Jalen Hurts) “I think it is extremely hard. He is a heck of an athlete, a really good football player. He makes it challenging on every single down, and I thought he executed well today.”

(On Erik McCoy’s injury early in the game) “It’s a big blow. I think he’s an important part of our offensive line and the way that we play up front. It was difficult to lose him, yet it is part of the game. We have to be able to step up and still play at an acceptable level when we lost guys like that.”

(On the adjustments that have to be made when losing a center) “It’s difficult, both from a mental standpoint and that guy making sure we’re getting onto the right people and doing the right things, not to mention the fact that he’s probably one of our better players on our offensive line. I think that was certainly a factor in the game, yet we have to be able to still perform.”

(On what he saw on the last explosive play with Goedert) “I think as the game went on I felt like they were trying to find ways to get him the ball, particularly after DeVonta Smith went out of the game. I thought that was the guy they were trying to get the ball to.”

(On the Eagles’ 65-yard touchdown run by Saquon Barkley) “I’m going to have to look at the tape to see exactly what happened on that. At the end of the day, the kid made a great run, and once he got into space, he’s a hard guy to catch, a hard guy to get down.”

(On his decision to go for it on fourth down at the start of the fourth quarter) “It was trying to win the game. I felt like we needed to be able to get a yard.”

(On why he didn’t challenge the play) “It’s technically a turnover, so you can’t challenge. New York looked at it, and it stayed.”

(On the offensive struggles after the first drive) "Listen, I think they did a good job. When you look at it, I think they did a better job up front than we did. I think that's really where it started. Again, that's a good football team that we played today. It's a team that was in the Super Bowl two years ago, and they started the season 10-1 last year. It's a good team; they beat us today. We have to regroup and get ready for Atlanta."

(On if the run game struggled because of the battle at the line) "I think it starts up there (in the trenches). As you get back in and watch the tape, we'll have a better feel for exactly what the issues were. I don't think we were as good, from an assignment standpoint across the board today. I think we made too many mistakes, and when you play a good team and you make mistakes, they take advantage of it. I thought they did that today."

(On if Taysom Hill was close to playing today) "We ended up deciding to rule him out. I'm hopeful he will be able to go next week."

(On if Derek Carr was injured in the game) "It looked like he took a shot on the last play, but I didn't get any report from the trainers on him."

(On if Demario Davis was injured in the game) "There at the end of the game, he had a little hamstring or groin tightness."

(On how his team responded to the adversity it faced in the game today) "Well, I'd say not good enough, yet we gave ourselves some chances. They just executed better than we did. We have to get ready to make some corrections and get ready for Atlanta."

(On if the run game struggles and the injury to McCoy was the reason for the failed fourth down attempt) "I think we have to get a yard. I don't think that weighed into the decision one way or the other. Like I said, I think they just executed better than we did."

QB DEREK CARR

On his injury status at the end of the game

"I just got the wind knocked out of me. I was fine. (I) Just needed a minute, but I'm good."

On offensive struggles

"I think they did a good job mixing up their fronts. They had a lot of dudes on the line of scrimmage, really set out to stop the run and they did a good job. You have to give credit to them. They made more plays than we did, we as an offense. I start with myself. I wasn't perfect in all of my stuff, and you go back and you've got to correct it. You knew adversity would happen at some point. It's not going to be that easy all the time. For us, it's a great opportunity. You get hit in the mouth, and with that said, I thought we responded to a tough, gritty game. It wasn't all just bombs and this kind of stuff. We had to grind it out a little bit, and still make plays at the end and all that kind of stuff. And at the very end, they made one more play than we did, and that's just how this game goes sometimes. There's no discouragement or anything like that. You're pissed because you lost, you're mad at that. You want to win all these games, but at the end of the day we played a really good football team and we knew what type of team they were. You turn the film on and we knew what we were going to get ourselves into. It was a grind, but they made more plays than we did."

On losing center Erik McCoy

"Yeah, it's hard, especially for communication and things like that, but I thought Lucas [Patrick] did a fantastic job. He's a veteran, super smart, he's been in this system in different varieties. I thought he did a great job. Obviously anytime you lose anybody on a football team, you never can just replace them. They bring a certain role, they bring a certain piece of the puzzle, but it's always next man up and I thought those guys battled. I thought they did a great job battling against one of the better fronts in our league."

On Eagles' preparedness for Saints' offense/studying film

"It could be. That's throughout the season, there'd different ebbs and flows of that. Coaches switching things and changing things, all of that. Again, you've got to give credit to their players and to their coaches. They beat us today, and as players and coaches we take that personal. But we still believe and we know we're a good football team. The belief is so strong in that room. Disappointed, because we want it real bad and we really believed we were going to pull that one out, but we didn't. So for us it's about staying positive, but making the corrections that we have to make and working on it during this week."

On attempted pass to Rashid Shaheed in the first half

"I thought it was close, but he's made so many of those plays for me. I'm going to keep throwing to him whenever he gets an opportunity. I trust my receivers so much. It was close, but that's football sometimes."

On the interception on the last drive

"At the very end someone just came free, and in that situation a sack is terrible. I was trying to just make a tight throw, hopefully that he would look for me as I was getting hit. I wish I had just tried to skip it, whatever, get to the next play, but in that situation with the clock and how many yards we needed to get, I just tried to make that play for our team and I didn't. I tried to stand in there and make a throw, and they ended up making the play."

On what the team can learn about themselves from this game

“This is a great opportunity for us to come in tomorrow and see if we bring that same energy that we’ve been bringing, but bring it to some more corrections, bring it into some things. Everyone’s going to look at this tape and it’s going to hurt, man, because you’re going to see things like ‘What the heck did I do there? Why did I do that?’ And again I say it, but that’s football. The teams that continue over this long race continue to improve. It’s a race to see who can improve the most towards the end, and it’s a great opportunity for us to look at some different fronts we hadn’t seen this year, to see some different kind of games, different kind of routes, different kind of throws for me, coverage, all of that, for me to be better than I was the last time. My commitment to this team and this organization is to be hard on myself and push our guys in the same way. That we look at it just like we look at it after a win. You’re hard on each other, and you’ve got to be hard on each other especially after this loss so we can be better.”

On not having as much success with the run game as in the first two weeks

“They did a good job. We had some good runs and we still were able to make some adjustments and have some really good runs, and I thought the pass game, too. There were some play actions I thought were good. I don’t want to overdo it. Coach [Jon] Gruden always told me ‘We didn’t lose, we just ran out of time.’ They beat us today, and we ran out of time on that one. I thought we were making good adjustments and started moving the ball well, so my confidence is high. Anytime you don’t start off hot it’s a grind a little bit, but I thought we handled it well.”

On the Chris Olave touchdown pass

“Cover zero. They had the safety matched up on Chris [Olave], and for us, that’s a great matchup. Just throwing it to my spot, and he ran it down like he always does and made that play.”

On the crowd volume

“It was electric. That was a playoff atmosphere, when we get to play in one of those, but it felt like that. That was amazing. We need them all year, because that’s such an advantage for us. The fans were fantastic. That was awesome. Hopefully (we will) make some corrections and give them more stuff to cheer about.”

On emotional swing of touchdown to then being back down

“In this game, most of these games, mostly every time, it comes down to one possession. You score when there’s time on the clock, the other team always has a chance. For me, I’ve tried my best to try and stay even keeled. Obviously you’re excited, and then when they score you’ve got to stay still ready to go, make your next read, and make the next throw. It really is a microcosm of what a football season is like, you’ve got to stay like this. You’ve got to trust your process, keep working, and enjoy the process, too.”

More on losing center Erik McCoy

“Again, anytime you lose anybody on a football team, you don’t just replace somebody. They bring a certain gift, they bring a certain talent and ability, leadership. But with that said, I thought Lucas [Patrick] did a great job. Again, I get work with him, too, during the week just in case something like this ever happens. You lose a guy like Erik and it hurts. He’s a captain, he’s a leader of our football team, so it hurts, but with football that stuff happens all the time. It’s next man up, and you’ve got to be able to pick right back up and the expectation doesn’t change. But I thought Lucas did a fantastic job of really listening to and communicating to the young guys, new coming in. Just watching him communicate. He’s a true pro, he’s a true leader, and I’m glad we have him.”

S TYRANN MATHIEU

On the loss

“It’s frustrating. Hat’s off to those guys. They made the plays when it mattered the most. You can play great defense for 55 minutes, and for five minutes, it can kind of get away from you. We will learn from it. It’s still early. We’re still confident in what we can do. Hat’s off to those guys. They executed in those moments.”

On the third down conversion to Eagles tight end Dallas Goedert on the game-winning drive

“It’s one of those situations where we are in man-to-man defense. It doesn’t matter if it’s third and 90 (yards) or third and three. We believe in us. Like I said, hat’s off to those guys. They executed. Clearly, they practice that particular play because we got that exact play maybe three or four times. I missed one tackle. Then, the next time we had three or four guys running into each other. Hat’s off to those guys. They executed in a critical moment.”

On what it does for the team to experience this adversity

“Adversity is a builder of life. You cannot go through life and expect great things without hiccups, without setbacks, without adversity. It sucks. We poured our hearts out into the game. We sacrifice a lot to get to Sunday, and we want to be able to win. It’s not just for us, but it’s for everybody. It doesn’t always go your way, but the positive is that there are a lot of great teams (and) a lot of great people that wouldn’t be great without hard times. Yeah, we’ve got another game next week, a divisional game, so we can’t sulk in this too long.”

On Jalen Hurts’ ability and today’s loss

“He’s an athlete. Year after year, a lot of guys come into this league at the quarterback position. A few of them are much more than quarterbacks; they are great athletes. Obviously, his team believes in him. He believes in himself. He has played in a lot of big football games. So, hat’s off to those guys. Like I said, they executed in the most critical moments of the game. It hurts. It sucks, but it is a part of it.”

On defensive stops in the red zone

“We always want to take the ball away and try our best to limit teams to three (points) when they get to the red zone. It doesn’t always go our way, but outside of a couple of third downs, I thought that we played hard. I thought that we played fast. There’s a couple of moments in the game where we kind of broke down as a defense. We will learn from it. The coaches will learn from it. Us, as players, we’ll learn from it. We’ll be ready for Atlanta next week.”

On Saquon Barkley’s 65-yard touchdown run

“We were in cover zero and we got beat. It’s like once he got past the first level, it was off to the races. Great play by him. They blocked it up pretty well. He kind of cut back to the left and there was nobody there. Great vision by him. Obviously, we want to make that play, we want to make that tackle. He made a great play. He made a great move.”

On if the defense overran on the on the Barkley 65-yard run

“Nobody overran it. We were blitzing from the left. He got the ball and cut back to the left and nobody was there. He ran bubble slant to the field, so all those guys were in man-to-man so they were following their man. Once he rolled off the tackle, it’s just paint. All you see is end zone.”

On the teams talking to each other on the field late in the game

“It’s an intense game and emotions get high. Obviously, it was a one point game for a while there. Defensively, obviously, we want to defend our home field. Me and Latt (Marshon Lattimore), we should never go to those guys’ sideline. So, we will learn from that. It happens to all of us, where emotions get the best of us. We didn’t really hear it much from those guys all game until they went up at the end. We will just be looking forward to playing again against those guys, hopefully.”

Opening statement

“We were a resilient team. There are resilient men on this team. Last week was rough. Last week was something that our guys had to pick themselves up off the mat. Every one of them did. You get better from your work and you get better from your experiences. Sometimes losing, you grow a little bit more from that. Not that you want to do it, but you grow a little bit more from that. These guys got better this week. When we talk about handling adversity, we talk about having the right mindset. You can have the victim mindset, which I think the world wants you to have, which is essentially looking at the negatives or you can have a purpose mindset. A purpose mindset is knowing that through bad things that happen that if you let it then you will get better. You control what you can control. We can’t think about what anyone thinks about us. We can’t control what anyone says about us. All we can control is our daily work and they did that. When you do that, then you’re going to be an example for somebody else. Our guys did that. All of guys showed how they handled adversity. Adversity happens in life all the time over and over and over again. You are going to have small losses in every single game whether it’s an interception or a fumble or me going for it in a fourth down scenario and we don’t get it. You have to overcome those things and I am so proud of those guys that they did that. It shows resilience. A team plays together. A team has each other’s back. I can’t tell you how many times Saquon (Barkley) and Jordan Mailata and Chauncy Gardner-Johnson came up to me and said we got your back. We got your back coach. This is a hard place to play. This is a hard place to win. Last time I was here, I think Drew Brees had the ball touch the ground one time. We got ran out of here. That’s a really good defense. That’s a good quarterback. That is a really good head coach that is defensive minded, Dennis Allen. To come in here and get a win like that is special. We’ll remember this. That brings a team closer together. I know my dad is going to text me and tell me that we need to win by a little bit more because I am making him nervous. When you win like that, it is special. We’re going to remember this one. We’re going to remember it on the way home, but then we’re going to move on. It’s just a special team win.”

On the resiliency of this team

“We know this is not sustainable. We said this after the Green Bay game. We have to take the ball away. We did in that critical scenario, but we still lost the turnover battle. It’s not sustainable to do it this way. We have to take care of the ball. We have to take the ball away from them. The defense played unbelievable. That’s a good offensive line. We played on their side of the line of scrimmage an awful lot. Jalen Carter played his butt off. Jordan Davis played his butt off when everyone was doubting them all week. What are we doing? Why are we drafting these guys? I’ve heard it all. I’ve heard everything. I try not to listen, but I have to talk to the media five times a week. They responded because they didn’t care what anyone thought. If they aren’t riding with us when we are losing, then they aren’t going to ride with us when we win. We heard it all. We heard everything. They heard it and they responded. All you can do is control yourself. You are always going to have people saying different things about you. They went out there and played their ass off all week. Vic Fangio put them in a great spot all week.

Clint Hurtt put them in a great spot by the way he drilled them. He was on their ass all week. They went out and responded and they did it.

On what he noticed through the week on defense to expect this performance

“You always have to have the right mindset going into it. It’s all about the growth mindset. Sometimes the ball bounces weird. We saw a ball hit the upright and go in. You can’t control the ball and how it bounces. All you can control is your response. Their response and mindset all week was a purposeful mindset. That’s what I am talking about. The way that we were getting scooped out of outside zone last week. They had a response. We could let it happen to us or respond. We responded by putting them in the right positions to potentially make a play and them playing the right technique. I said last week no matter what is called, it’s about playing on the right side of the line of scrimmage, striking the defender and then tackling. That’s what they did. You don’t want to lose, but sometimes you get better from those losses. We know that teams are going to watch the tape this week and see us playing on their side of the line of scrimmage an awful lot. That’s what I’m talking about. I didn’t see Zack Baun get cut today. Why? Because he worked his ass off to do it. I didn’t see Jalen Carter getting scooped on the backside because we saw him in the backfield a lot. That’s what I’m talking about with this response. Having the right mindset. I could talk about this all day long and this mindset that you have after adversity happens to you. That is life. These guys learned good lessons. I’ve taken so much joy in not only teaching them lessons of football, but lessons of life. They taught themselves that today and just how to respond when shit goes bad in their life.”

On the 61-yard pass play to Dallas Goedert

“I saw a great throw by Jalen (Hurts) in the midst of chaos. That place is loud. That place is so loud. We’ll get ready for the crowd noise in Tampa, but holy smokes this place is loud. I saw Jalen completely operate in chaos. The two things we talked about was that we have to be physical in this game. That’s a physical football team. We have to have poise because it’s going to be loud. Jalen operated in chaos. The offensive line had good protection. Dallas ran a good route. You can look at it, but there was help from some other guys in that case with the guys and how they ran into each other on that one. A couple things that we teach in that scenario, and they executed perfectly. Dallas just went. He just turned it on and went. (170 yards) is a lot for a tight end. He’s an explosive player. Shallow routes like that are so critical that the ball is out in front of him, so that he can have a ball to run with. I don’t want that to be overlooked. If Jalen puts it here and he has to slow down at all then the guy gets to come back and make that play. The pursuit comes. Jalen put it here from what I saw and Dallas could just go. It was a great call by Kellen (Moore). It was a perfectly executed call by the guys. Just so if anyone is wondering about the fourth and one call at the end of the half, I called that not Kellen. I called that play at the end of the half. Kellen did not. I called it. I thought that was what was best for our football team in that particular case. It was my decision. I did it. It didn’t work. I’ll get better from it. It was the play I thought was going to work in that particular case. It didn’t work. It’s not on Kellen. It’s not on the players. I put them in a bad spot and I made that call.”

On Jalen Hurt’s ball security

“You have to understand that there is a lot those goes into an interception. It’s more than meets the eyes. The interception has a lot of moving parts. If the player makes a mistake, then it is always on me and me first. Nobody else. It is on me first. I was taught early in this game by my dad that if you are not coaching it and if something happens on that field then it is your responsibility. Nobody else’s responsibility. That’s being a man. That’s what being a man is. Taking responsibility for the shit that you are in charge of. That’s my responsibility. First and foremost, the interception is on me. On the fumble, we have to get two hands on the football and Jalen will learn from that. We’ll have a good response from that. It’s nice to get a win and get out of it. We have to take care of the ball better. There is no doubt. The running backs are doing a really good job of taking care of the football. It just takes one every once in a while with one hand on the ball. If you have one hand on the ball and someone touches your arm, then it’s tough and it’s going to come out. You have to get two hands on the ball and

he'll be the first one to tell you that. He played his butt off today. Jalen Hurts is a winner. He is a winner. He wins. You tell me when he hasn't won. He's a winner. I'm proud of him. I can't say enough good things about his response. He has the same look on his face the entire game. He's getting excited and I love that about him. He knows it's the sum of all the plays that says who you are. Not just one play that everyone is going to talk about. It's not just one play. It's the sum of all plays. He's the quarterback and he is a freaking winner. He won at Alabama. He won at Oklahoma. He's been winning here over and over and over and over. We are the Philadelphia Eagles and we understand that we are going to get criticism. This dude is a freaking winner. Jalen Hurts is a winner. He won today."

On DeVonta Smith and how is he

"I don't know yet. I haven't gotten with the guys yet. He was able to get up on his own. DeVonta Smith is one of the toughest dudes I know. He is one of the toughest dudes I know. I'll get an update on how he is doing. Obviously, he didn't come back in the game. If he would have been able to, then he would have. DeVonta Smith is tough. When one of your best players has that much physical and mental toughness, then that is contagious. You find yourself as a head coach of everything that you talk about with connection, accountability, toughness and detail. The toughness that was played on that field today against a tough team and DeVonta Smith is a warrior. He is tough. He puts his body on the line. These guys put their bodies on the line play in and play out He is one guy that does that all the time. I hope that he is OK. He got up on his own and we'll see. I'll get some information, and we'll see. He's a warrior and he's tough."

QB JALEN HURTS

On his chemistry with TE Dallas Goedert

Yeah, you know, we obviously have a lot to utilize on offense, it's just about giving them the opportunity to do so. I think we called his number quite a bit today, and he showed up. A lot of guys showed up. He [Dallas] had a great moment. He had a great moment. I'm proud of him. I attest all of that to the grind that we put in. I attest that to the times we were having conversations in the off season, and he's coming to Houston, spending a lot of time there, building that connection and building that rapport, just waiting for the opportunity to come when his number is called. And he had a career day to day, and not only him, obviously say Saquon [Barkley], but the defense had a career day in just the way our they responded off of a tough game last week, in a short week. I'm so excited for them. I am so happy for them and excited to see them continue to grow, and obviously us grow as a team.

On playing much of the game without starters, especially during the game-winning drive

"I noticed that as the game went on that there were some new faces in the huddle. But it didn't matter. It didn't matter. We were able to persevere. And like I said, it's, you know, it's games like that. When it's gritty, you have to overcome some things that are in front of you. You lean on the preparation; you lean on the preparation. And we have moments from last week's game that we learn from very directly, very directly situationally, how we approached it, how we played it, and some moments that we definitely won back. But even for a guy like Parris Campbell to step in; I think he had three or four catches – that's time spent in the offseason not knowing where your number is going to be called. At one time he was at a moment where he didn't know if he was going to make the roster or not, and look at, you know, look at him showing up. So tons of love and respect for him and how he showed up. Even Jahan [Dotson], how he showed up when his number was called, obviously, Smitty [DeVonta Smith] prayers out to him. I don't know anything, but I know it's a special game for him, and I'm happy as a team, we found a way to win in his home state. And so hopefully that's something that he could, you know, hear these words and be proud of."

On what he saw on the 61-yard pass play with Goedert

"We had a great setup there. Great, great call, and just made a great play, you know. Obviously getting the ball to the guy that I needed to in that situation, and he did the rest okay. He told me, if he had my speed, he would have scored, but we figured it out anyway."

More on the 61-yard play and the pre-snap check in such a loud environment

You know, it's operation. You never want to get too high or too low in those moments. You're going to have things that happen in the game. You have things that go your way and some that don't you know. You have things that you want back and things that you'd be proud of. But in the end, it's about how you execute it and trust in the preparation to put ourselves in different situations, to be prepared for those things. And there are some things that don't come up, that you didn't think about, but it's all a learning thing. I said here this week where after last week's game, and I said to you guys, it's really no difference between winning and losing. It's a matter of if you learned. And I'm just excited that we were able to learn from last week's game and this game, and hopefully we can continue to just learn as we move forward.

RB SAQUON BARKLEY

On what flipped for the team in the fourth quarter after things were so dry in the first three?

“I mean, you know, obviously the game wasn't going our way, but we never gave up. We kept trusting each other, kept working. When we had our teammate go down late, we rallied behind that and embraced the opportunity. Especially our defense. They played lights out.”

On what he saw on his 65-yard touchdown run

I just remember seeing Tyrann [Mathieu]. He was down, so I knew it was safety one high and I knew I had a lot of space to the right. Then the O-line blocked it perfectly. You know, against Green Bay, if I would have just went right, I probably would have had two long runs so I learned from my mistakes.

On what was said to the team after last week's loss to turn things around

Nothing. We just kept trusting the process. Kept working. We understand that when things like last weekend happens, everyone thinks the world is ending. It really doesn't matter what the outside world thinks. It matters what happens in our locker room. Today, we just kept trusting each other. Kept having each other's back. That's what team football is about.

On Jalen Hurts' demeanor when he had two first half turnovers

“He's the most, poised human being I've ever been around in my life. He doesn't get flustered, never too high, never too low, to be honest, only being around for however many months, I've learn a lot from him as a player and as a man too. So, he's the leader of this team. Obviously, his turnover is not what you want to happen, but it's part of the game. It's all about how you're responding. He responded with a two-minute drive going down the field, made a big play to Dallas [Goedert] and Dallas ran his butt off. Jalen is our leader, and we follow him.”

TE DALLAS GOEDERT

On if the gameplan was intentionally to get him more involved in the offense

“We had plays that were called for me today. A little bit more than the first couple games. But, like I said, anytime my number gets called, I'm going to do whatever I can to be able to make a play. It is always fun to be involved, but we have so many special players on this offense that when it's my time, I'm going to do what I can, and when it's AJ's [Brown], time, he's going to do it, Smitty [DeVonta Smith], you know, everybody. We got an incredible squad. So, you know, we just have to stay patient and wait for our times.”

On Jalen Hurts' performance

“Jalen is Jalen, man. He's a calm, cool, collected guy. Before we had the two-minute opportunity, I sat down to him, and I'm like, you know we're good. He says, I know we're good. It's just something that when your quarterback has that much confidence, when the game's on the line, he's going to make the play. He's calm, and that brings everybody else back down, you know, just levelheaded, and we can go out there and move on to the next play. And he's a big part of that.”
