**THE MATCHUP**

Coming off a hard-fought 24-17 win over the Chicago Bears in the Caesars Superdome on Sunday, the New Orleans Saints moved into sole possession of first place in the NFC South. They will look to win their third consecutive contest heading into a Week 11 bye, when they face the Minnesota Vikings at U.S. Bank Stadium Sunday. The matchup features two hungry 5-4 teams that have overcome adversity.

New Orleans showed a nose for the ball, while taking perfect care of it offensively, as they snared five takeaways from the Bears. The defense recorded four of the five takeaways in the second half, while surrendering only three points to power a complementary victory in all three phases. An opportunistic New Orleans defense is ranked first in the NFL with 12 interceptions.

QB **Derek Carr** finished an efficient 25-of-34 for 211 yards with two TDs and zero interceptions. QB **Taysom Hill** made significant impact in the run game and passing game, leading the Saints in rushing with 11 carries for 52 yards, tossing a three-yard TD to TE **Juwan Johnson** and catching a two-yard score from Carr. With the receiving touchdown, Hill became the first player since QB/HB Frank Gifford to have at least ten career rushing touchdowns, ten passing touchdowns and ten receiving touchdowns.

Defensively, CB **Paulson Adebo** enjoyed the finest performance of his three-year career, finishing with seven tackles (five solo), a career-high two interceptions, one forced fumble, one fumble recovery and three passes defended. LB **Demario Davis** added a club-best ten tackles, while his late fourth quarter sack/forced fumble that was recovered by LB **Pete Werner** helped preserve the victory. DE **Cameron Jordan** added seven tackles and a sack, while S **Marcus Maye** tied a career-high with his second interception of the season.

The Vikings come into the matchup winners of four straight contests as Sunday's 31-28 come-from-behind victory over the Atlanta Falcons which helped catapult the Saints into first place. After losing QB Kirk Cousins to a season-ending Achilles injury in Week Eight and his backup Jaren Hall to a concussion early in Sunday's contest, their recent acquisition Joshua Dobbs steadied the Vikings' ship and finished with three touchdown passes, including the game-winning score with 27 seconds remaining in the thrilling contest.

Around The NFC South: The Carolina Panthers (1-7) will play at the Chicago Bears (2-7) on Thursday night, the Tampa Bay Buccaneers (3-5) will host the Tennessee Titans (3-5) on Sunday and the Falcons (4-5) will play at the Arizona Cardinals (1-8).

THE COACHES

Dennis Allen was hired as the 17th head coach in New Orleans Saints history on February 8, 2022. Now in his 28th year coaching and 21st in the NFL, Allen has spent 13 seasons in New Orleans in two separate stints, including the six-and-a-half campaigns (2015-21) as the team's defensive coordinator prior to being promoted to head coach. He succeeded Sean Payton, who coached the team for 16 seasons, including the 2009 campaign, when Allen was secondary coach and ended with the Super Bowl XLIV championship. When Allen took control of a Black and Gold defense in Week 11 of the 2015 season that was ranked 32nd both in opponent net yards per game and opponent points per game, he methodically molded a unit that has finished in the top 10 in both categories each of the last three years. From 2017 to the present, New Orleans is the only defense in the NFL to rank in the top five in the National Football League in both opponent rushing yards per game and sacks.

In his first year as head coach of the Saints, Allen guided New Orleans through the challenge of significant injuries at several positions to win three of their last four games after a Week 14 bye and give up 20 or fewer points in the final eight contests of the season, ten points apiece in the final three.

Carrying over to the 2023 season, a stingy Saints defense is ranked first in the NFL with 12 interceptions, seventh in opponent net yards per game and opponent points per game, while an emerging offense has scored 24 or more points in three consecutive contests to have the Black and Gold for first place in the NFC South.

Before rejoining the Saints coaching staff in 2015, Allen served as head coach of the Oakland Raiders from 2012-14 and as defensive coordinator of the Denver Broncos in 2011. Prior to his first stint in New Orleans from 2006-10, Allen was also an assistant with the Atlanta Falcons from 2002-05, where he received his NFL coaching start.

Over the course of his coaching career in New Orleans, Allen has coached linebacker Demario Davis and defensive end Cameron Jordan to career seasons. Davis has led the team in tackles in every campaign since signing with the club as an unrestricted free agent in 2018 and has garnered *AP* All-Pro honors four straight times. Since Allen returned to New Orleans in 2015, Jordan's 88.5 sacks rank third in the NFL.

Allen played safety at Texas A&M from 1992-95, where he started the final 21 games of his college career before being signed as an undrafted free agent by the Buffalo Bills in 1996. Prior to entering the National Football League coaching ranks in 2002, Allen served as a graduate assistant at his alma mater from 1996-99 and as secondary coach at the University of Tulsa from 2000-2001. He

earned a bachelor of business administration degree and a master's in kinesiology from Texas A&M.

Raised in Hurst, Texas, Allen and his wife, Alisson, have a daughter, Layla and a son, Garrison.

Named the 10th head coaching in Vikings history on Feb. 16, 2022, **Kevin O'Connell** joined the Vikings after serving as the offensive coordinator for the Los Angeles Rams from 2020-21, including a Super Bowl LVI victory. Has eight seasons of NFL coaching experience, including three seasons as an offensive coordinator for the Washington Redskins (2019) and Los Angeles Rams (2020-21). In his first season as head coach in 2022, led the Vikings to 13 wins the most by any first-year head coach in franchise history, earning the club's first division title since 2017. O'Connell had seven players win Player of the Week awards in 2022, the most by a first-year head coach in franchise history. Seven notched Pro Bowl berths and three earned *Associated Press* All-Pro honors. O'Connell heavily emphasized his team becoming "situational masters" since becoming the 10th head coach in franchise history, pointing to areas that might not always be prominent on stat sheets but are crucial to winning games. Minnesota saw immediate improvement in these areas, finishing 11-0 in one-score games during the regular season after going 5-8 in those same situations in 2021. The team also had an NFL record-tying 10 comeback wins in 2022, including overcoming a 33-point halftime deficit in Week 15 against the Colts, the greatest comeback in NFL history. Prior to joining the Vikings in 2022, O'Connell guided Rams QB Matthew Stafford and WR Cooper Kupp to career years in 2021. Kupp was named the 2021 NFL Offensive Player of the Year by the *Associated Press* and Super Bowl LVI MVP. O'Connell worked in Washington, serving as quarterbacks coach in 2017-18 and the offensive coordinator in 2019. He coached QB Kirk Cousins in 2017, helping him throw for more than 4,000 yards and 27 touchdowns, and record a career-high 342 rushing yards and a league-leading four game-winning drives. O'Connell worked on special projects with the San Francisco 49ers in 2016. He was also quarterbacks coach in Cleveland during the season.

The former San Diego State quarterback played for five teams in a five-year career. Born May 25, 1985 in Knoxville, Tenn. He and his wife, Leah, have two sons, Kaden and Kolten, and two daughters, Quinn and Callie.

SAINTS-VIKINGS CONNECTIONS

New Orleans defensive end **Cameron Jordan** was born in Minneapolis while his father Steve, who was a seventh round draft pick of Minnesota in 1982 out of Brown, played tight end for the Vikings from 1982-1994. Steve was a three-time All-Pro, six-time Pro Bowl selection from 1986-91, for whom he played his entire career, finishing with totals of 498 receptions for 6,307 yards and 28 touchdowns and was named one of the 50 greatest Vikings of all-time. He went into the Vikings Ring of Honor in 2019...New Orleans defensive back **Jordan Howden** played at the University of Minnesota...Vikings punter **Ryan Wright** handled punting duties at Tulane from 2018-21...Saints Assistant Offensive Line Coach **Kevin Carberry** served on the same Los Angeles Rams coaching staff in 2021 and the same Washington Redskins staff in 2017 with Minnesota Head Coach **Kevin O'Connell**, Offensive Coordinator **Wes Phillips** and Quarterbacks Coach **Chris O'Hara**. Phillips' late grandfather, Bum, served as head coach of the Saints from 1981-85, while his father Wade, was defensive coordinator during the same period and took on interim head coaching duties for the final four contests of the 1985 campaign....O'Hara served on the Jacksonville Jaguars coaching staff from in 2020 under Saints Offensive Line Coach **Doug Marrone**, who was head coach. Minnesota quarterback **Joshua Dobbs** was a backup for the Jaguars in 2019 when Marrone was head coach and was also a backup in Cleveland in 2022, when Saints Defensive Coordinator **Joe**

Woods served in the same position. Saints running back **Alvin Kamara** and Dobbs were college teammates at Tennessee. New Orleans defensive back **Lonnie Johnson Jr.** and Dobbs were teammates with the Tennessee Titans in 2022...Minnesota quarterback **Nick Mullens** played at the University of Southern Mississippi...Vikings Wide Receivers Coach **Keenan McCardell** served as Marrone's wideouts coach in Jacksonville from 2017-20...New Orleans Offensive Coordinator **Pete Carmichael** and Vikings Inside Linebackers Coach **Greg Manusky** served on the same San Diego Chargers coaching staff from 2002-05...Minnesota Assistant Director of College Scouting **Pat Roberts** previously served as the head strength coach and offensive line coach at Millsaps (Jackson, Miss.) College...Vikings Asst. Director of Sports Performance **Derik Keyes** is a Laurel, Miss. native who played at Louisiana-Lafayette and had coaching stints at his both alma mater and the University of South Alabama...Minnesota wide receiver **Justin Jefferson** prepped at Destrehan (La.) HS and played at Louisiana State University...Vikings defensive end **Marcus Davenport** was a first round draft pick of the Saints in 2018 and played for New Orleans his first five NFL seasons...Vikings guard **Ed Ingram** played at LSU from 2017-21...New Orleans center/guard **Cesar Ruiz** and Vikings safety **Josh Metellus** were college teammates at the University of Michigan...Vikings defensive end **Jonathan Bullard** played at the University of Florida with Saints safety **Marcus Maye**...New Orleans Assistant Head Coach/Special Teams Coordinator **Darren Rizzi** and Vikings Offensive Line Coach **Chris Kuper** served on the same coaching staff with the Miami Dolphins from 2016-18. Rizzi also served on the same Dolphins staff with Vikings Defensive Backs Coach **Daronte Jones** in Miami from 2016-17. Jones served on the Nicholls State coaching staff in 2002, as defensive coordinator at Franklin (La.) HS in 2003 and as defensive coordinator at LSU in 2021. Rizzi tutored Vikings kicker **Greg Joseph** as a rookie in the 2018 preseason with the Dolphins...New Orleans Pro Scout **Tosen Eyetsemitan** and Vikings General Manager **Kwesi Adofo-Mensah** worked together in the same Cleveland front office in 2020...Vikings defensive end **Danielle Hunter** played at Louisiana State University...New Orleans Assistant Special Teams Coach **Phil Galiano** tutored Minnesota long snapper **Andrew DePaola** both in College at Rutgers and with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers from 2012-13. Saints quarterback **Jameis Winston** and DePaola were teammates in Tampa Bay from 2015-16. Galiano and Vikings Tight Ends/Passing Game Coordinator **Brian Angelicho** served on the same Rutgers staff in 2011 and same Buccaneers staff from 2012-13...New Orleans practice squad cornerback **Cameron Dantzler** was a third round pick of the Vikings in 2020 and played for Minnesota from 2020-22...Saints Director of Football Administration **Scott Kuhn** spent the prior 16 seasons as a member of the Vikings player personnel staff.

SERIES HISTORY

Minnesota leads the regular season series, having won 20 of 32 contests since the teams first met on October 13, 1968 at Tulane Stadium and four of five postseason meetings; the Black and Gold won that first matchup 20-17. The Saints would not beat the Vikings again until Sept. 3, 1978, losing six straight contests in the interim. Though the Vikings have a firm grasp of the overall series record, the Saints have fared much better since 2009. The teams have met on ten occasions since then, seven times in the regular season and three in the postseason and New Orleans has captured six, including a 52-33 win on Christmas Day, 2020, when RB **Alvin Kamara** tied NFL records with six rushing touchdowns and six overall touchdowns. The Saints and Vikings have met five times in the playoffs, including the Black and Gold's first ever postseason game in 1987, which the Vikings seized at the Superdome, 44-10. The third playoff meeting proved to be the charm, however, as the two clubs met at the Superdome on Jan. 24, 2010 for the NFC Championship as New Orleans defeated the Vikings 31-17 to send the Saints to Super Bowl XLIV.

Finished two-for-two on field goal attempts with a career-long of 54 yards and a 53-yarder and went a perfect 4-for-4 on PAT attempts. Also had five kickoffs sail through the end zone for touchbacks. Grupe was the first Saints kicker to boot two field goals of at least 50 yards in a contest since John Carney (at St. Louis, 9/26/04), only the fifth Saints player to do so overall and only the sixth occurrence.

Offensive Coordinator Pete Carmichael - Late father, Pete, served as an NFL assistant from 1994-2003 following a long college coaching career, with the Jacksonville Jaguars (1994-99), Cleveland Browns (2000) and Chicago Bears (2002-03).

Senior Offensive Assistant Bob Bicknell - Father, Jack spent 13 seasons as a head coach in NFL Europe. Brother, Jack Jr. served as an assistant with the New York Giants, Kansas City Chiefs, Pittsburgh Steelers and Miami Dolphins.

Offensive Assistant D.J. Williams - Father, Doug, is a veteran of Washington's front office, who won Super Bowl XXII as their starting quarterback, the pinnacle of a storied 12-year pro football career, which includes him being in the Buccaneers Ring of Honor, also working in the Tampa Bay front office.

Vice President/Assistant General Manager-College Personnel Jeff Ireland - Stepson of Kansas City Chiefs Hall of Fame linebacker/center E.J. Holub. Grandson of Eagles running back and Bears personnel exec. Jim Parmer.

National Scout Terry Wooden - Brother, JoJo, is Director of Player Personnel for the Los Angeles Chargers.

Quarterback Derek Carr - Older brother, Derek, was the No. 1 overall pick in 2002 by the Houston Texans and played 11 years with Houston, Carolina, the New York Giants and San Francisco. Uncle, Lon Boyett, played tight end for Tampa Bay, the Raiders and San Francisco.

Linebacker Demario Davis - Late cousin Steve McNair was a former standout quarterback for the Houston Oilers/Tennessee Titans (1995-2005) and Ravens (2006-07).

Tight End Taysom Hill - Brother-in-law, David Nixon played linebacker for the Raiders (2009), Houston Texans (2010) and St. Louis Rams (2010-11).

Passing Game Coordinator/Quarterbacks Coach **Ronald Curry** - A seventh round draft pick (235th overall) of the Oakland Raiders in 2002 out of the University of North Carolina and played for Oakland from 2002-08, appearing in 76 games with 32 starts, registering 193 receptions for 2,347 yards with 13 touchdowns.

Assistant Offensive Line Coach **Kevin Carberry** - Prior to entering the coaching ranks, Carberry competed in training camps of the Cleveland Browns (2005) and Carolina Panthers (2006) and spent the 2005 season on the Detroit Lions practice squad. He also played for the Berlin Thunder of NFL Europe in the spring of 2006. From 2007-08, Carberry played in the Arena Football League for the New York Dragons and Philadelphia Soul and was a member of the Soul's 2008 Arena Bowl Championship squad, starting his coaching career at Chicago high schools in the off-seasons.

Offensive Assistant **Jahri Evans** - Evans was selected by the Saints in the fourth round (108th overall) of the 2006 NFL Draft and spent the first 11 seasons of his 12-year playing career with the Saints. Overall, he started 183 career regular season games at right guard for the Saints (2006-16) and Green Bay Packers (2017), 169 for the Black and Gold. Evans was a six-time Pro Bowl selection, a five-time *Associated Press* All-Pro and was named to the Pro Football Hall of Fame's 2020's All-Decade Team, as New Orleans finished in the Top Ten in total offense each of the 11 seasons he lined up for the Saints, while the 196 sacks surrendered by the offensive line over the period were the lowest in the NFC and second-lowest in the NFL. After being selected as a consensus All-Rookie in 2006, Evans was a Pro Bowl starter and consensus first-team All-Pro each season from 2009-12. He was inducted into the Saints Hall of Fame in 2020, the Louisiana Sports Hall of Fame in 2022 and was a semifinalist for the Pro Football Hall of Fame's Class of 2023.

Defensive Assistant **Matt Giordano** - Giordano was a fourth round draft pick of the Indianapolis Colts in 2005 and enjoyed a nine-year NFL career with the Colts (2005-08), Green Bay Packers (2009), Saints (2010), Oakland Raiders (2011-12) and St. Louis Rams (2013), starting 30-of-116 career games, accumulating 202 tackles, one sack, 11 interceptions, including two returned for touchdowns, 16 passes defended, two forced fumbles, 52 special teams stop and one coverage fumble recovery. He also appeared in seven postseason games for the Colts and Packers and was a member of Indianapolis' Super Bowl XLI championship team.

BUCKING THE ODDS

The Saints have a long tradition of finding players as free agents signed after the draft that make an impact immediately or developing their careers initially on the team's practice squad. Several undrafted Saints on the roster play key roles on offense, defense and special teams that the club developed.

Wide Receiver/Return Specialist **Rashid Shaheed** came to New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Weber State in 2022 after being one of the all-time best Division FCS returners and after spending the first five weeks on the practice squad, made an immediate impact, becoming the only Saint to score a touchdown in each of his first two offensive touches. In the December 18 win over Atlanta, he finished with three receptions for 95 yards, with a 68-yard touchdown grab from Taysom Hill, the longest play from scrimmage of the season for New Orleans and the fifth-longest receiving TD by a Saints rookie all-time. On the Christmas Eve win at Cleveland in challenging conditions, Shaheed led the team in receiving with four grabs for 41 yards. In the January 1 victory at Philadelphia, he led the team in receiving for the third consecutive week, posting six receptions for 79 yards, including a 58-yard grab to set up a field goal. Overall, he carried four times for 57 yards with a 44-yard touchdown, caught 28 passes for 488 yards (17.4 avg.) with two TDs, returned 20 punts for 193 yards (9.7 avg.) and returned 14 kickoffs for 320 yards (22.9 avg.).

In 2023, Shaheed is no longer a secret, as he has caught 26 passes for 501 yards (NFL-best 19.3 avg.) with a team-leading three touchdown grabs, including six grabs of 40-or-more yards, while also carrying six times for 33 yards and ranking first in the NFC and second in the NFL in punt return average (15.4) and all purpose yards (1,054). On Sept. 24 in Green Bay, he had his first career punt return for a touchdown, the second-longest scoring return in franchise history (76 yards). Oct. 1, vs. Tampa Bay, Shaheed had a 29-yard return, making him the first Saint to have a return of at least 25 yards in back to back contests since

Darren Sproles (9/25-10/2/11).

Oct. 29, at Indianapolis, Shaheed had a breakout performance, catching three passes for 153 yards (51.0 avg.), including a 58-yard touchdown grab. Shaheed's 51.0 yards per reception average was ranked third in team history as he became only the third Saint to record 150+ yards receiving on three catches. Shaheed also added four punt returns for 46 yards to total 199 all-purpose yards.

Defensive end **Carl Granderson** played in 15 games in 2021 with three starts and posted 24 tackles and three sacks. In 2022, he posted 53 stops (30 solo) and a career-high 5.5 sacks, recovering the first fumble of his career, Dec. 5 at Tampa Bay. In the Christmas Eve win at Cleveland, Granderson, sacked Browns QB Deshaun Watson at the Saints 22-yard line on fourth down with 19 seconds left in the fourth quarter to secure the win. The following week on January 1, 2023 at Philadelphia, he posted two stops, 1.5 sacks of QB Gardner Minshew, one stop for loss and two quarterback hits, as Granderson posted at least half a takedown in three consecutive weeks for the first time in his career.

Earning the starting right defensive end position in 2023, Granderson has posted 39 tackles, leads the team with 5.5 sacks to tie a career-high, and has forced a fumble and recovered one, signing a four-year contract extension on September 23.

P **Lou Hedley** was signed following the 2023 NFL Draft by the Saints out of the University of Miami, where he played from 2019-22 and punted 206 times for 9,315 yards with a 45.2 gross punting average and 77 inside-the-20. The Australia native, who won the punting job in a punting competition in training camp at 30 years old earned All-ACC second-team honors in 2021 and was selected as a semifinalist for the Ray Guy Award, honoring the nation's top punter. In 2020, Hedley was recognized with AP second-team All-American honors and a Ray Guy Award finalist, as the Hurricanes ranked second in the FBS in net punting average. In 2023, he has punted 43 times for 1,830 yards with a 42.6 gross punting average, a 39.8 net and 20 inside the 20-yard line.

Kicker **Blake Grupe** was signed by New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Notre Dame, where he played his

graduate campaign in 2022, after handling kicking duties at Arkansas State from 2017-21. In 2022, he led the Fighting Irish with 91 points on 14-of-19 field goals and a perfect 49-for-49 in PATs. The Missouri native was Arkansas State's career record holder in scoring (354), field goals (64) and PATs (162). In the 2023 preseason, Grupe secured a roster spot, by making five-of-six field goal attempts.

In the team's first nine games, Grupe has made 18 of 23 field goal attempts and all 19 PAT attempts to lead the team with 73 points, with 43 touchbacks on kickoffs, tied for second in the NFL.

Grupe enjoyed a standout performance in the Oct. 8 34-0 shutout with a career-long 54-yard field goal and a 53-yarder and hitting all four PATs to go with five of his seven kickoffs sailing into the end zone for touchbacks. Grupe became the first Saint to boot two field goals of at least 50 yards in a contest since John Carney (at StL, 9/26/04), only the fifth Saint to do so overall and only the sixth occurrence. He earned NFC Special Teams Player of the Week.

Wide Receiver **Keith Kirkwood** originally joined the Saints as an undrafted free agent out of Temple in 2018. The New Jersey native spent the first two months of his rookie season on the New Orleans practice squad, before being signed to the active roster at midseason and recording 13 receptions for 209 yards (16.1 avg.) with two touchdowns. He added one more scoring grab in the NFC Divisional playoff win over Philadelphia to help the Saints advance to the NFC Championship. After spending most of the 2019 campaign on Injured Reserve and playing for Carolina from 2020-21, Kirkwood returned to New Orleans in 2022, where he contributed on offense and special teams. In the 2023 preseason opening win over Kansas City, he caught a four-yard touchdown pass from QB Derek Carr.

0 – Number of points surrendered by New Orleans in the Oct. 8 31-0 shutout at New England. With the defense under Head Coach Dennis Allen's supervision since 2016, the Saints have had four of the franchise's 17 shutouts.

New Orleans is the only team to have three shutouts since 2021. The Saints have had at least one shutout in each of the past three seasons for the first time since the 1987-89 teams (1986-89)

1 – With the Sept. 10 16-15 season-opening win over Tennessee, Allen became the first Saints head coach to win his first two season openers in charge of the team.

2 – Jordan become only the second Saint to play in 200 regular season contests on Oct. 29 at Indianapolis. On Sunday vs. Chicago, he became only the second Saint to open 200 regular season contests.

He is currently ranked first in the National Football League in yards per catch (19.3) with six receptions of 40 yards or more and second in punt return average (15.4) and in all-purpose yards (1,054). Rashid also is tied for the team lead with four total touchdowns.

4 – The number of times New Orleans has posted a shutout since 2017 following the October 8, 34-0 win at New England.

5 – The Saints have won a franchise-record five consecutive season openers dating back to the 2019 season. The five-game winning streak for season openers is the longest current running streak in the NFL. Also the career-high number of passes defended CB Alontae Taylor had on Sept. 24 at Green Bay.

6.5 – The career-high number of sacks in 2022 by linebacker Demario Davis, who was selected to the Pro Bowl for the first time. Davis has three sacks in 2023 to lead the linebackers and rank second on the team.

7 – The number of Ring of Honor members, including LB Sam Mills who was inducted posthumously on Dec. 2, 2021 at halftime and was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 2022 to join former Saints teammates in K Morten Andersen, Jackson and T William Roaf.

8 – The number of Pro Bowl selections by Jordan, the most in club history by a defensive player and second in club record books. Among defensive ends, only Reggie

White, Bruce Smith and Gino Marchetti have been selected to more.

PRACTICE MAKES PERFECT

A spot on the practice squad is another avenue to eventually get onto the active roster and have the opportunity to contribute. Below is an overview of eight key contributors players on the club's 53-man roster with extensive practice squad experience.

Tight End **Juwan Johnson** was signed by New Orleans out of Oregon, where he spent his graduate transfer season, following the 2020 NFL Draft as a wideout. Recording four receptions for 39 yards in seven contests, Johnson spent the majority of his rookie season on the practice squad. Converted to tight end in 2021 and leading the position group with four touchdowns, Johnson took advantage of his first full offseason strength and conditioning program in 2022, led the tight ends group with 42 receptions for 508 yards with a club-best seven TD grabs, tied for third in the league at his position. On Sunday vs. Chicago, Johnson reached the end zone for his first touchdown grab of 2023, leading tight ends with 13 grabs despite missing four games with a calf injury.

After spending his first three seasons with the Seattle Seahawks, contributing on both defense and special teams, defensive back **Ugo Amadi** split the 2022 campaign between the Titans active roster and the Kansas City Chiefs practice squad, also appearing in one contest for Super Bowl champion Kansas City. Possessing the versatility to play in multiple roles, Amadi secured a roster spot with the Saints in the 2023 preseason, recording eight tackles, one interception, two passes defended and one coverage stop. He has contributed on both defense with one tackle and two passes defended and on special teams in all nine contests.

After splitting his rookie season in 2018 between the practice squad and active roster, defensive back **J.T. Gray** enjoyed a breakthrough campaign in 2019, when he was selected *Associated Press* second-team All-Pro when he recorded 16 special teams tackles, one blocked punt and one coverage fumble recovery. In 2021, he was selected as a first-team All-Pro and to his first career Pro Bowl (starter), when he led the NFL with 19 special teams tackles (league-leading 16 solo). Gray led the team with 12 special teams stops in 2022, despite missing three games with a hamstring, the third time in four seasons, he has led New Orleans in coverage tackles. He has four special teams stops and one defensive tackle in 2023 despite missing three games with injuries. Backed by Gray's performance, leadership and knowledge, New Orleans is ranked first in the NFL in opponent punt return average (5.0).

WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed** came to New Orleans as one of the all-time best Division I-AA returners and after spending the first five weeks on the practice squad, made a quick impact on Oct. 16 vs. Cincinnati with a 44-yard rushing TD. With his 53-yard receiving touchdown on October 20 at Arizona, Shaheed became the only Saint to score touchdowns on each of his first two career offensive touches. In addition to finishing with 28 grabs for 488 yards (17.4 avg.) with two touchdowns, Shaheed also handled return duties for New Orleans since being activated, bringing back 20 punts for 193 yards (9.7 avg.). He made big contributions in the Sept. 10 season opening win over Tennessee with a career-high 216 all-purpose yards, including five receptions for 89 yards, including a 19-yard touchdown and a late fourth quarter 41-yard grab to help secure the victory. In the Sept. 18 win over Carolina, he posted four catches for 63 yards (15.8 avg.), including a fourth quarter 45-yard grab. On Sept. 24 at Green Bay, Shaheed had a 76-yard punt return for a touchdown.

In 2023, Shaheed has caught 26 passes for 501 yards (NFL-best 19.3 avg.) with a team-leading three touchdown receptions, including six grabs of 40-or-more yards, while also carrying six times for 33 yards and ranking first in the NFC and second in the NFL in punt return average (15.4) and all purpose yards (1,054).

WR **Keith Kirkwood** originally joined the Saints as an undrafted free agent out of Temple in 2018. The New Jersey native spent the first two months of his rookie season on the New Orleans practice squad, before being signed to the active roster at midseason and recording 13 receptions for 209 yards (16.1 avg.) with two touchdowns. He added one more scoring grab in the NFC Divisional Playoff win over Philadelphia to help the Saints advance to the NFC Championship. After spending most of the 2019 campaign on Injured Reserve and playing for Carolina from 2020-21, Kirkwood returned to New Orleans in 2022, where he has contributed on both offense and special teams.

LB **Nephi Sewell** was signed by New Orleans following the 2022 NFL Draft out of Utah and appeared in four games as a rookie, contributing on special teams, while spending the remainder of the campaign on the practice squad. Sewell has progressed on both defense and special teams and secured a spot on the 53-man roster, posting four coverage tackles and one defensive stop.

Originally a third round draft pick of the Broncos in 2018 out of Boston College, CB **Isaac Yiadom** has played in 79 games with 21 starts for Denver, the Giants, Green Bay,

Houston and New Orleans and has posted 120 tackles, a split sack, two interceptions, 19 passes defended, one forced fumble and 24 special teams stops. After starting 2022 with the Texans, Yiadom joined the Saints practice squad midway through the season and upon being signed to the active roster, recorded two special teams stops in six appearances.

In 2023, Yiadom has contributed on both defense and special teams, playing in all nine games with one start, recording 13 tackles, one interception, seven passes defended and four coverage stops to tie for second on the team, only two away from his career-high.

On the following page is a synopsis of several returning players and newcomers through the draft and free agency to the 2023 Saints offensive line:

RT Ryan Ramczyk - The Black and Gold used their second first round selection in the 2017 NFL Draft to snag Ramczyk out of Wisconsin, one of the best offensive linemen in the entire draft. After opening all 16 games and both postseason contests in 2017 and being selected as a PFWA All-Rookie, he has been selected as an AP All-Pro selection three times since. After missing seven contests in 2021, Ramczyk rebounded to open the first 16 games in 2022 and continues to anchor the right side of the line.

T/G James Hurst - A nine-year NFL veteran who was signed as a free agent from Baltimore in 2020, Hurst has 141 career regular season appearances with 86 starts at four different positions on the inside and outside. His versatility came in handy in 2020, as he started two contests at left tackle and one at left guard, while the Saints gained over 200 yards rushing each time. In 2021, Hurst moved into the lineup for eight games at left tackle in place of an injured Armstead, two at left guard in place of an injured Andrus Peat and three at right tackle for an injured Ryan Ramczyk. Hurst started 15 games at left tackle and one at left guard in 2022. In 2023, Hurst has opened five games at left guard, one at left tackle and one at right guard.

T/G Andrus Peat - A first round selection (13th overall) in the 2015 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Peat was considered one of the top college linemen in 2014. In nine seasons, he's played in 102 regular season games with 93 starts, opening a contest at every position except center. In 2020, he opened 13 contests at left guard as he was part of the NFC Pro squad for the third consecutive season. In 2021, he opened the first six contests, where New Orleans got off to a 4-2 start before suffering a season-ending pec-toral injury. In his return to the starting lineup in the 2022 season opener in Atlanta, New Orleans rushed for 151 yards. In back-to-back weeks, Peat was a part of rushing efforts of 200-yards plus by the club for the first time since 2020. In 2023, Peat has started one contest at left guard and the last three at left tackle.

C/G Erik McCoy - New Orleans traded up in the second round of the 2019 NFL Draft to select this standout from Texas A&M, who was a three-year starter, anchoring the middle of the Aggies line. In 2018, he was a team captain who paved the way for the SEC's leading rusher and in 2019 was the first Saint in franchise history to start at center in Week One, opening all 16 contests. McCoy has opened all 66 contests he has appeared in at center and signed a five-year contract extension with the team in 2022.

G/C Cesar Ruiz - The hard-working, talented and intelligent lineman is a perfect fit for New Orleans' culture. He was selected with the 24th pick in the 2020 NFL Draft out of the University of Michigan. The three-year letterman played in 36 games in college, starting his last 31 including the final 26 at center, earning All-Big Ten in 2019. Ruiz settled in at right guard in the last 15 games, with nine starts, as well as both postseason contests. When McCoy suffered a lower leg injury in the first quarter of the 2021 opening win over Green Bay, Ruiz transitioned over to his natural position, where the Saints did not give up a sack in his four starts at center. He returned to right guard on Oct. 25 at Seattle and was the only lineman in 2021 to not miss a start. Ruiz opened 13 games at right guard and one at center in 2022 before suffering a season-ending foot injury Dec. 18, vs. Atlanta. The 46 consecutive starts for Ruiz at the time of his injury was the longest active streak for a Saint. Following an ardent rehab, Ruiz returned to the starting lineup for the season opener on September 10, the day after signing a four-year contract extension.

T Landon Young - A mainstay at left tackle for his college career at Kentucky, Young played in 49 contests with 30 starts in his college career. The Lexington, Ky. native was selected by New Orleans in the sixth round of the 2021 NFL Draft and held up to the competition in training camp to snare a roster spot. Young opened one contest at right tackle in 2021 and serves as Ramczyk's backup on the right side, also playing jumbo tight end. In 2022, Young showed versatility. On October 13 at Pittsburgh, he slide over to left tackle for the second half to replace Hurst (concussion) and opened this the November 20 win over the Rams at one of the league's most challenging positions. In the January 1, 2023 win at Philadelphia, Young played the final three quarters in place of Ramczyk (hip) and then started the following week's finale vs. Carolina.

T Trevor Penning - The club's second first round draft choice (19th overall) in 2022 out of Northern Iowa, the 6-7, 322-pound Penning competed with Hurst for the starting left tackle slot in the preseason before suffering a toe injury. The Clear Lake, Iowa native brings athleticism and extensive college experience to the tackle position, where he played in 37 games with 33 starts. Activated for the second half of the season, Penning served as the club's sixth offensive lineman in jumbo packages and started the season finale at left tackle, carrying over in 2023 to see action at the position in six-of-nine contests played.

G/C Max Garcia - The nine-year NFL veteran was signed

as a free agent at the start of training camp. This versatile lineman has played in 114 regular season games with 62 starts for New Orleans, Arizona and Denver, including opening the last three contests at left guard. Originally a fourth round draft pick of Denver out of Florida in 2015, who started five contests as a rookie for the Super Bowl 50 champions, Garcia has opened 46 games at right guard, 12 at left guard and four at center.

IN THE NFL

After finishing ranked seventh in 2021, surrendering 318.2 net yards per game, the New Orleans defense returned to the top five again in 2022, ranking fifth, while giving up 314.8 net yards per game. New Orleans and San Francisco are the only two teams to rank in the top ten each of the last three seasons and this marked the third time the Saints have ranked in the top ten in total defense for three straight seasons (1982-84 and 1991-93).

A third round draft pick of the Denver Broncos in 2018 out of Boston College, in addition to starting 21 of his 79 career contests on defense and posting 119 tackles, a split sack, two interceptions, 19 passes defended and a forced fumble, **Isaac Yiadom** has recorded 24 career coverage stops for five teams. Brought up to the active roster during Gray's injury, Yiadom brought a boost to the Saints coverage units with three stops, remaining an integral part of the group after Gray's return to the lineup and re-signing in the offseason. In 2023, Yiadom ranks second on the team with four special teams tackles, only two away from his career-high.

On Oct. 29, at Indianapolis, Yiadom downed a punt at the Colts three-yard line in the third quarter. In Sunday's win over Chicago, Yiadom played a key role on a punt with the Bears starting field position at their two-yard line.

One of the club's two third round draft picks in 2020, **Zack Baun**, a former Wisconsin standout, has embraced work on the team's special teams units. He has recorded 20 tackles on coverage, one blocked field goal and 52 defensive stops, one interception and one pass defense. On Sept. 10 at Tennessee, Baun got his hands on a punt that went out of bounds one yard past the line of scrimmage, a game-changing play.

Selected in the fifth round of the 2022 NFL Draft by the Saints out of Appalachian State, LB **D'Marco Jackson** came to New Orleans as the only Football Bowl Subdivision player with more than 200 tackles and 25 stops for loss in the 2020 and 2021 seasons combined. After missing his entire rookie campaign with a hamstring injury, Jackson's hard-working and hard-hitting mentality has proven to be a good fit on the team's coverage units as he leads New Orleans with five stops, tying a career-high with two on October 8 at New England.

DB **Lonnie Johnson** was signed by New Orleans as a free agent in the offseason after spending his first three seasons with the Houston Texans and the 2022 campaign with the Tennessee Titans. Johnson has posted 17 career special teams stops, including two with New Orleans in 2023. On Oct. 19, at Jacksonville, Johnson had a fumble recovery off a muffed punt for his first career special teams takeaway.

Signed as an undrafted free agent in 2022 out of Utah, Sewell appeared in four games on special teams as a rookie. In 2023, the sure tackler secured a spot on the team's coverage units and is tied for second on the team with four stops to go with one defensive tackle.

DEREK CARR

- On March 6, 2023 the New Orleans Saints agreed to terms with QB Derek Carr on a four-year contract to solidify the team's quarterback position. He spent the first nine seasons of his NFL career with the Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders. Originally selected in the second round (36th overall) of the 2014 NFL Draft by the Raiders out of Fresno State, the Bakersfield, Calif. native has started all 151 career regular season games he's played in, completing 3,408-of-5,274 passes (64.6 percent) for 37,343 yards with 227 touchdown passes, 103 interceptions and a 91.6 passer rating, while adding 868 rushing yards and six touchdowns. From 2014-22 as a member of the Raiders, Carr was selected to four Pro Bowl Games (2015-17, 2022) and set numerous team passing records including the franchise's career passing yardage and touchdown pass marks and single-season mark in passing yards (4,804 in 2021), as the only signal-caller in the team's history with multiple seasons reaching the 4,000 yard mark. He also holds franchise records from his Raiders tenure for multiple-touchdown pass games (69), contests with a passer rating of at least 100.0 (47) and 300-yard passing performances (33).
- Since entering the league in 2014, Carr ranks third in the NFL in completions, fourth in passing yardage and seventh in passing touchdowns. He became the third quarterback in history to pass for 3,000-plus yards in each of his first nine seasons, joining Pro Football Hall of Fame signal-caller Peyton Manning and Russell Wilson. He is just the fourth player in NFL history to reach 35,000 passing yards in his first nine seasons. He has completed 292 passes of 25+ yards since he entered the league in 2014, the fourth-most in the NFL over that span. His 151 starts are the most by a quarterback since 2014.
- Carr enjoyed a successful Saints debut in the Sept. 10 win over Tennessee, when he completed 23-of-33 passes (69.7%) for 305 yards with one touchdown, one interception and a 96.1 passer rating.
- Carr helped lead New Orleans to a 20-17 victory at Carolina on Monday Night Football on Sept. 18, when in the second half, he completed a 42-yard pass to Chris Olave and a 45-yard pass to Rashid Shaheed to set up the Saints' two touchdowns.
- On Sept. 24 at Green Bay, Carr had completed 13-of-18 (72.2%) of his passes for 103 yards with an eight-yard scoring throw to TE Jimmy Graham and a 104.6 passer rating to help put New Orleans ahead 17-0 over the Packers before being forced to leave in the third quarter with a sprained AC joint injury.
- Carr was a model of efficiency in the Oct. 8 34-0 shutout of New England, completing 18-of-26 passes (69.2%) for 183 yards with two touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 114.7 passer rating, his highest as a Saint to date.
- On Oct. 15 at Houston, Carr finished 32-of-50 passing (64.0 pct.) for 353 yards, one touchdown and one interception, also carrying two yards for a first down. It was the tenth-highest passing yardage total of Carr's career and his highest total as a Saint to date.
- On Oct. 19 vs. Jacksonville, Carr completed 33-of-55 passes for 301 yards with a 17-yard touchdown pass to WR Michael Thomas, as he became the first Saints passer to have back-to-back weeks of at least 300 yards passing since Drew Brees in Weeks 14 and 15 of the 2019 campaign.
- In the Oct. 29 win at Indianapolis, Carr was in complete control, as he completed 19-of-27 passes for 310 yards with two touchdowns, including a 58-yard touchdown pass to Shaheed, one of two completions of 50-yards or more to the second-year speedster, as he became the first Saints passer to have three consecutive weeks of at least 300 yards passing since Brees did so in four straight from Dec. 21, 2015-Sept. 11, 2016. It was also the first time Carr threw for 300 yards in three straight contests since Weeks One-Three of the 2021 campaign.
- In Sunday's 31-24 win over Chicago, Carr completed 25-of-34 passes (73.5) for 211 yards, two touchdowns and a 108.8 passer rating. Carr engineered a fourth quarter, go-ahead, game-winning drive, where he completed both passing attempts for 18 yards, a drive which contributed to putting New Orleans in sole possession of first place in the NFC South.

A constant participant on special teams from midseason in 2017 to midseason in 2020, as well as the backup signal-caller and as a runner and receiver, in 2018, Hill averaged 24.9 yards per return on 14 kickoff returns, had six coverage stops, second on the team, completed a ten-yard pass on a fake punt and blocked a punt. Overall, Hill carried 37 times for 196 yards (5.3 avg.), third on the team, with two touchdowns and completed three of seven passes for 64 yards. The blocked punt that sparked a division-clinching win at Tampa Bay, earned him Week 14 NFC Special Teams Player of the Week honors. In the postseason, he caught a touchdown, made a special teams tackle and executed a successful fake punt, making significant contributions in all facets as the team advanced to the NFC Championship game for the third time in franchise history.

- In 2019, Hill carried 27 times for 156 yards (5.8 avg.) with a touchdown, catching 19 passes for 234 yards with six TDs, deflecting a punt and posting two coverage stops. He ranked third on the club in touchdowns and third in receiving TDs. After a multi-threat performance Thanksgiving night at Atlanta, when he deflected a punt and caught and rushed for a touchdown. Hill became the first quarterback to rush for and catch a touchdown in the same contest since Jim McMahon (1983). In a valiant postseason effort vs. Minnesota, Hill led the team in rushing with four carries for 50 yards, caught two passes for 25 yards with a TD and completed a 50-yard pass.

- In 2020, Hill contributed on multiple facets, completing 88-of-121 passes (72.7%) for 928 yards with a 98.8 rating, rushing 87 times for 457 (5.3 avg.) yards with eight touchdowns, catching eight passes for 98 yards with a TD and playing on special teams units until Brees' rib injury. Following Brees' injury, Nov. 15, Hill went 3-1 in four starts.

- In 12 games with nine starts in 2021, providing value at quarterback on offense and special teams, he completed 78-of-134 passes for 978 yards with four touchdowns, carried 70 times for 374 yards (5.3 avg.) with a club-best five touchdowns, caught four passes for 52 yards and added a special teams stop.

• In 2022, Hill assisted the Black and Gold offense in multiple facets. He contributed on both offense and special teams in the season opener at Atlanta. Hill carried four times for a club-best 81 yards (20.3 avg.), including a career-long 57-yard carry, as well as an 11-yard rushing touchdown on the same first quarter drive of his long run. Hill also caught a pass for a two-yard gain and contributed on multiple special teams units both on the coverage and return teams. Overall, he ranked second on the team in rushing with 96 carries for a career-high 575 yards (club-best 6.0 avg.) with a club-best seven rushing touchdowns, nine catches for 75 yards with two scores, leading the team in total touchdowns, while completing 13-of-19 passes for 240 yards with two touchdown throws and a 146.3 passer rating.

• In 2023, Hill has carried 49 times for 255 yards (5.2 avg.), with a team-high three rushing touchdowns. He has caught a career-high 20 passes for 142 yards with one touchdown and completed five-of-six passing attempts for 72 yards with one touchdown, while adding one special teams tackle.

RENAISSANCE MAN

Hill enjoyed an all-around standout versatile performance in Sunday's win over Chicago, when he led the team in rushing, carrying 11 times for 52 yards (4.7 avg.), completed a three-yard touchdown pass to TE Juwan Johnson and caught four passes for 13 yards with one touchdown. With his touchdown reception from Carr, the tenth of his career, Hill became the first player since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger and the first player since QB/HB Frank Gifford to have at least ten career rushing touchdowns, passing touchdowns and receiving touchdowns. Hill has 26 rushing touchdowns, 11 touchdown passes and ten touchdowns in his career and became the second player in NFL history with at least 25 rushing touchdowns, ten touchdown passes and ten touchdown receptions, joining Gifford (34 rushing touchdowns, 14 touchdown passes and 43 touchdown receptions). Given the historical element of Hill's accomplishments, the Pro Football Hall of Fame has requested several items that were worn and used by Hill in his historic performance for exhibit to fans.

RUNNING BACKS

ALVIN KAMARA

• A talented runner and receiver with a 5-10, 215-pound frame who was selected by the Saints in the third round of the 2017 NFL Draft out of the University of Tennessee, Kamara enjoyed an outstanding rookie campaign. He ranked first on the club and sixth in the NFL in yards from scrimmage (1,554), second on the team in rushing and re-

ceiving, carrying 120 times for 728 yards (6.1 avg.) with eight TDs and a two-point conversion, catching 81 passes for 826 yards (10.2 avg.) with five TDs and a kickoff return for a TD for a club rookie record 14 total scores, tied for second in the NFL. Kamara finished first in the NFL in yards per carry.

• Kamara was the first Saints offensive rookie selected to the Pro Bowl since Rueben Mayes (1986), as an *AP* second team All-Pro (flex), the clubs' first rookie All-Pro since 1993. He was named *The Sporting News* NFL Rookie of the Year and *AP* NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year.

• In six games in 2023, Kamara leads New Orleans in rushing with 95 carries for 346 yards and two touchdowns, leading NFL running backs in receiving with 43 receptions for 272 yards with one touchdown for a club-best 618 total yards from scrimmage.

SCRIMMAGE LEADER

Since entering the National Football League in 2017, Kamara ranks second in the league in total yards from scrimmage (9,506). Kamara is the first NFL player since Julio Jones (2014-19) to have six consecutive seasons of at least 1,300 total yards from scrimmage.

In the Saints' 2020 Christmas Day 52-33 win over Sunday's opponent, the Vikings, Kamara tied the NFL record for total touchdowns and rushing touchdowns (6), as he carried 22 times for a career-high 155 yards (7.0 avg.), adding three receptions for 17 yards for 172 yards from scrimmage. The rushing touchdowns record tied the record held by Ernie Nevers of the Chicago Cardinals since Nov. 28, 1929, while for total touchdowns, Kamara joins Nevers, Cleveland's Dub Jones (Nov. 25, 1951) and Chicago's Gayle Sayers (Dec. 12, 1965). After Kamara's two-touchdown performance in the 2021 Week Five win over Washington, Kamara's 19 career games with at least two touchdowns are tied with four players for the third-most such games by a player in his first five seasons in NFL history. JAMAAL WILLIAMS

- Signed by the Saints as an unrestricted free agent from Detroit in the offseason, Williams is a talented runner who had a breakout season in 2022, as he led the National Football League and set a Lions single-season franchise record for rushing touchdowns with 17. In 17 games with nine starts for Detroit, Williams added on 262 attempts for 1,066 rushing yards and 12 receptions for 73 yards, producing the first 1,000 yard rushing season of his career.

- The former BYU star's talent came consistently all over the field, as well as in short bursts, as ten of his rushing touchdowns in 2022 came from exactly one yard out, tied for third-most in NFL history. A sound ballcarrier, he went 752 career touches before fumbling the ball and became the league's first active running back to reach 600 carries before fumbling.

- Since being drafted by Green Bay in the fourth round (134th overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft, Williams has played in 95 games with 42 starts, totaling 956 attempts for 3,776 yards and 30 touchdowns, while adding 165 receptions for 1,212 yards and eight touchdowns against only five fumbles.

WIDE RECEIVERS

CHRIS OLAVE

• A talented wide receiver who became one of the most prolific receivers in Buckeyes history, Olave played in 47 games and caught 176 passes for 2,711 yards (15.4 avg.) with 35 touchdowns. Olave's 35 career touchdown receptions set an Ohio State program record and ranks fourth in Big Ten history. His 11 career 100-yard games also ranks second in school history. Olave entered the starting lineup in 2019 with immediate results. He helped lead the Buckeyes to three consecutive Big Ten championships (2018-2020) and back-to-back College Football Playoff appearances (2019, 2020). In the 2020 CFP Semifinal vs. Clemson, Olave had a career night, hauling in six passes for 132 yards and two touchdowns in a 49-28 win, securing a bid to play in the championship game. Olave seamlessly integrated into the Saints offense following a standout senior campaign, where he caught 65 passes for 936 yards (14.4 avg.) and 13 touchdowns, tied for sixth nationally, as he was selected as an AFCA first-team All-American and a consensus second-team All-American.

• Following a September, where he captured NFL Offensive Rookie of the Month honors with 17 grabs for a league rookie-best 268 yards, including scoring receiving touchdowns in back to back contests, Olave led the team in receiving, yards per catch and receiving yardage with 72 grabs for 1,042 yards (14.5 avg.) with four touchdowns along with a successful two-point conversion, ranking second among rookies in receiving yardage and tied for second in catches and third down grabs (26). Olave became the first Saints rookie since Danny Abramowicz (1967) to lead the team in receiving, receiving yardage and yards per catch in his first campaign. The receiving yardage total was second all-time among Saints rookies, as he was only the third Black and Gold rookie to reach 1,000.

• A talented wideout with a 6-3, 212-pound frame who was selected by the Saints in the second round of the 2016 NFL Draft out of Ohio State, Thomas had an outstanding rookie campaign, leading the team with 92 receptions for 1,137 yards and a nine touchdowns. He became the first Saints rookie to break 1,000 yards since Marques Colston (1,038-2006). TIGHT ENDS

JUWAN JOHNSON

- The former Penn State and Oregon wideout joined the Saints in 2020 following the NFL Draft and transitioned to tight end his second season. In 2022, the New Jersey native had a breakout campaign as he appeared in 16 games with 12 starts and finished with 42 receptions for 508 yards and a team-best seven touchdown grabs. Johnson's touchdown grab total was tied for third among National Football League tight ends.

- In five games in 2023, Johnson has 13 receptions for 95 yards with one touchdown to lead the tight end corps in receiving. After missing four contests with a calf injury, Johnson's returned to action Oct. 29 and has been an asset as a receiver and a blocker.

FOSTER MOREAU

- This veteran tight end and New Orleans native enters his fifth National Football League season and first with the Black and Gold after spending his first four seasons with the Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders. In his career, Moreau has appeared in 68 regular season games with 39 starts and has recorded 102 receptions for 1,222 yards (12.0 avg.) with 13 touchdowns and has posted at least 30 catches in each of his last two campaigns. In 2022, the former Jesuit High School and LSU standout set career-highs in receptions (33) and receiving yards (420), while adding two touchdowns.

- Moreau got on the scoreboard for the first time as a Saint on Oct. 8 at New England with a fourth quarter six-yard grab. He has 11 grabs for 115 yards to lead the tight ends corps in receiving yardage.

JIMMY GRAHAM

- New Orleans' third round draft choice in 2010 after playing four years of basketball and just one year of football at the University of Miami (Fla.). Graham broke out in his second year with the Saints totaling 99 catches for 1,310 yards with 11 touchdowns and went on to lead the team in receiving for four consecutive seasons. Graham's production has been among the top 10 in NFL history at the tight end position in all three major categories: receptions, yards, and receiving touchdowns. Graham posts career totals of 714 receptions, 8,514 yards, and 86 touchdowns. His 86 receiving touchdowns rank 4th all time among NFL tight ends, while his 52 touchdowns as a Saint rank 2nd in franchise history. He and Kansas City's Travis Kelce are the only two tight ends in NFL history to have multiple seasons of 1,200-plus receiving yards and 10- plus receiving touchdowns. Graham returns to New Orleans, the location of his most personal and team success, after playing in seven campaigns with three other teams.

Graham's 86 career touchdown receptions rank fourth among tight ends all-time, his 714 receptions seventh and his 8,514 receiving yards eighth.

• New Orleans' first choice in the 2011 NFL Draft (24th overall) out of California, Jordan enjoyed another standout season in 2022, recording 66 tackles, a club-best 8.5 sacks for a loss of 67.5 yards, a team-high 12 stops for loss and 14 quarterback hits, two passes defended and two forced fumbles to tie for the team lead.

• In 2023, Jordan has started every contest and has recorded 31 tackles (13 solo), two sacks, three passes defended and one fumble recovery for a defense that is ranked seventh in the NFL in opponent net yards per game and opponent points per game.

Jordan's the only NFL defender to record at least 300 tackles, 60 sacks, 75 stops for loss and 90 quarterback hits since 2017. Since 2017, Jordan has posted 370 stops, 71 sacks, 88 tackles for loss and 130 quarterback hits.

FOUR IN A ROW

KHALEN SAUNDERS

•Originally selected by the Chiefs in the third round (84th overall) of the 2019 NFL Draft out of Western Illinois, Khalen Saunders enters his fifth NFL season and first with the Saints. The St. Louis, Mo. native has appeared in 47 career regular season games with 14 starts, recording 108 tackles (51 solo), 4.5 sacks, two passes defended and three stops for loss. The fifth-year pro has also appeared in six postseason contests, posting eight tackles (six solo) and one sack as a member of Kansas City’s Super Bowl LIV and LVII Championship teams. Saunders comes to the Saints after turning in his most productive season as a pro in 2022, setting career highs in games played (16), tackles (48), sacks (3.5) and stops for loss (three).

• In 2023, Saunders has started every contest and has recorded 27 tackles for a defense that is ranked seventh in the NFL in opponent net yards per game and opponent points per game. Adding value, he has served as a fullback on offense on goal line packages.

LINEBACKERS

DEMARIO DAVIS

• This dependable and sure-tackling defender joined the New Orleans Saints in 2018 after spending his first six National Football League seasons with the New York Jets and Cleveland Browns. For his career, the Brandon, Miss. native has appeared in 186 career regular season games with 172 starts for the Jets (2012-15, 2017), Cleveland (2016) and the Saints (2018-), recording 1,279 stops (823 solo), 39 sacks, three interceptions, 54 passes defended, four forced fumbles, seven fumble recoveries and 24 special teams tackles. With a club-best seven stops on Jan. 1, 2023 at Philadelphia, Davis joined Bobby Wagner and Lavonte David as only the third active NFL player with 1,200 stops.

• In 2018, Davis opened all 16 contests and led the team with 110 stops (74 solo), five sacks to lead the linebackers, four passes defended, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. Davis' abilities to diagnose and tackle played a key role in New Orleans ranking *second in the* NFL in opponent rushing yards per game and opponent rushing yards per play. Participating in the postseason for the first time, Davis led the defense with 22 stops (15 solo), an interception in the NFC Championship and a pass defense.

• In 2019, he posted 111 stops, ranked first on the club, four sacks, one interception and 11 passes defended to help spur the league's fourth-ranked run defense.

• In 2020, Davis filled up the stat sheet with a team-leading 119 tackles (74 solo), four sacks and six passes defended, becoming the first Saint to lead the team in tackles in three consecutive seasons since Jonathan Vilma (2008-10).

IRON MAN

Davis who had never missed a game in his career until December 27, 2021 vs. Miami due to COVID-19 protocols, ranks as one of the league's most durable defenders, while playing one of the game's most physically demanding positions. His 158 consecutive games played streak was the longest in the NFL by a position player and his 79 straight games started were the most at his position. In 2022, Davis was one of three Black and Gold starting defenders to open every contest, joining safety Tyrann Mathieu and defensive tackle David Onyemata. More impressive, he was the only linebacker in the NFL to play in every defensive snap for his teams.

PETE WERNER

- New Orleans selected this three-year starter from Ohio State in the second round of the 2021 NFL Draft. The Indianapolis native finished his college career playing in 47 career games with 35 starts, recording 185 tackles (111 solo), 16 stops for loss, four sacks, 11 passes defended, four forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Werner helped power the Buckeyes to the College Football Playoff championship game as a senior in 2020, when he was voted by Big Ten coaches as a first-team All-Conference selection and a Butkus Award semifinalist, posting 54 tackles, 2.5 stops for loss, one sack and two forced fumbles. Werner made his second career start Oct. 3 vs. the Giants and recorded a ten tackles. With 13 stops in Week Five at Washington, he became the first Saints rookie defender to reach double-digit totals in back-to-back games. He ranked fifth on the team with 59 tackles.

- Werner enjoyed a standout 2022 season, appearing in 12 games with 11 starts at weakside linebacker and ranked third on the team and second at the linebacker position, despite missing five games, with 79 tackles (55 solo), three stop for loss, three passes defended, two forced fumbles and one special teams tackle.

- Werner got off to an impressive start for the 2023 season, finishing second on the team with eight stops in the Sept. 10 season-opening win over Tennessee, one stop for loss and a split sack, his first career takedown. He recorded his first career interception this on October 8 in a 34-0 shutout at New England. Leading or tying for the team lead in stops in the last three contests, Werner is ranked second on the team with 53 stops, a split sack, one interception, one pass defense and a fumble recovery, which took place late in the fourth quarter Sunday to preserve a 24-17 win over Chicago.

SECONDARY

S TYRANN MATHIEU

- This versatile, hard-hitting, playmaking safety and New Orleans native returned home, signing after the draft and brings extensive experience to the secondary. Mathieu was selected by the Arizona Cardinals in the third round (69th overall) in the 2013 NFL Draft out of LSU and has played for the Cardinals (2013-17), Houston Texans (2018), Kansas City Chiefs (2019-21) and now the Saints. In 11 NFL seasons, he has played in 155 regular season games with 146 starts and has posted career totals of 732 tackles (606 solo), 42 stops for loss, ten sacks for a loss of 78 yards, 30 interceptions for 406 returns yards, four brought back for touchdowns, 94 passes defended, four forced fumbles, seven fumble recoveries and five special teams stops. Mathieu has been selected to three Pro Bowls, three Associated Press All-Pro teams and the Pro Football Hall of Fame's 2010's All-Decade Team.

NOSE FOR THE BALL

Mathieu came to New Orleans after starting all 16 games he played in for Kansas City in 2021 and recording 76 tackles, one sack, a career-high three fumble recoveries, one sack and two interceptions to earn his second consecutive Pro Bowl selection. With a team-leading three picks and one fumble recovery, adding up to a team-best four takeaways to go with a career-high 91 tackles (club-best 64 solo) to rank third on the team and first in the secondary.

Mathieu's 30 picks since coming into the league in 2013 are tied for fourth in the NFL.

CB MARSHON LATTIMORE

• Selected by the Saints in the first round (11th overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft, Lattimore started all 13 games he appeared in. He totaled 53 tackles (44 solo), a forced fumble, one fumble recovery, five interceptions for 85 yards and 18 passes defended, as he became the youngest Saint (21 years old) ever selected to the Pro Bowl and was selected as the AP NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year.

• In 2018, Lattimore opened all 16 contests and posted a career-high 59 tackles (49 solo), two interceptions, 12 passes defended, a club-best four forced fumbles (tied for fourth in the NFL) and three fumble recoveries returned for 91 yards, leading the team in takeaways and tied for the NFL lead in defensive fumble recoveries, the highest total among defensive backs.

• A standout 2019 campaign by Lattimore resulted in him being voted to the Pro Bowl, the only Saints cornerback to ever be selected multiple times. Lattimore started all 14 games he played in and posted 57 stops, one interception and ranked first on the team with 14 passes defended.

• In 2020, he posted a career-high 62 tackles (52 solo), two interceptions and 11 passes defended as he was voted to the Pro Bowl for the third time.

• After signing a contract extension in 2021, Lattimore continued to fulfill high expectations as he posted 68 stops, three picks, a career-high 19 passes defended, ranked third in the NFL and one fumble recovery, being selected to his fourth Pro Bowl.

• After missing ten games (abdomen) in 2022, Lattimore returned to action Jan. 1, 2023 at Philadelphia and made an instant impact, tying for the team lead with six solo tackles, a team-high two passes defended and returning an interception 12 yards for a touchdown for New Orleans' first defensive score of the season. He started all seven games he appeared in and posted 21 stops, the pick for a score and four passes defended.

• To open 2023, Lattimore came up with a standout performance in the season-opening win over Tennessee. In addition to his 15th career pick, to move him into a tie for eighth place in club record books in interceptions, he also had four passes defended, the third time in his career, he has deflected at least four throws in a contest.

GET A HAND ON

Lattimore's 85 passes defended since entering the NFL in 2017 are the most by a Saint and ranked third in the league despite missing ten games in 2022. In 2023, Lattimore is second on the team with eight passes defended.

CB PAULSON ADEBO

• New Orleans' third round selection (76th overall) in the 2021 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Adebo overcame not playing college football in 2020 to make significant contributions to the Saints secondary in his first season with the club. The Texas native finished his college career playing in 22 games with 21 starts for Stanford and recording 97 tackles, 34 passes defended and eight interceptions, earning All-Pac 12 honors in both 2018 and 2019.

• Adebo showed his development by opening opposite Lattimore in the 2021 regular season opening win vs. Green Bay and returning a pick 33 yards in the third quarter to become the first Saints defender to have an interception in his NFL debut since LB James Allen vs. Tampa Bay on September 8, 2002. He then added a second pick in the Week Five win at Washington. With a pick in the regular season finale at Atlanta, Adebo finished his rookie campaign ranked fifth on the club with 63 tackles (54 solo), tied for first with three picks and added eight passes defended and two special teams stops.

• Adebo fought off injuries in 2022 and played in 13 games with 12 starts to lead the team's corners with 60 tackles (51 solo) and added seven passes defended for the NFL's second-ranked club in opponent passing yards per game.

•Sharpened by an extensive training camp competition, Adebo is enjoying a standout campaign despite missing two contests with a hamstring injury. Following a two interception, three total takeaway performance in Sunday's 24-17 win over Chicago, Adebo has 27 tackles, four interceptions, 11 passes defended, two forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Adebo's four interceptions are tied for second in the NFL, while his six total takeaways are tied for first in the league with Baltimore Ravens S Geno Stone. His team-leading pass defense total for the team leading the NFL in passes defended is ranked third in the league.

CB ALONTAE TAYLOR

•Selected by the Saints in the second round (49th overall) of the 2022 NFL Draft out of Tennessee, Taylor shook off early injuries to play in 13 games with nine starts and posted 45 tackles (38 solo) and a club-best 11 passes defended.

S MARCUS MAYE

•Originally a second round draft pick of the New York Jets in 2017 out of the University of Florida, Maye is a seven-year NFL veteran who has recorded career totals of 391 tackles (270 solo), 4.5 sacks, eight interceptions, 28 passes defended, five forced fumbles and one fumble recovery in 74 career games, all starts. Despite missing five contests in 2022, Maye recorded 60 tackles and one forced fumble. Maye is coming off a pair of performances in back-to-back contests, where he has led the team with a total of 18 tackles, adding two passes defended in the December 18 win over Atlanta. 18 months removed from Achilles surgery, Maye will team with Mathieu for a formidable safety tandem.

•At the start of the third quarter of September 10 season-opening win over Tennessee, May recorded his first interception of a Saint, when he picked off Titans QB Ryan Tannehill to extinguish a potential scoring drive. CHICAGO BEARS VS. NEW ORLEANS SAINTS SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 5, 2023 • CAESARS SUPERDOME GAME NOTES

- With the Saints improving to 5-4 and taking over sole possession of first place in the NFC South, their next contest will be at the Minnesota Vikings on Sunday at U.S. Bank of America Stadium followed by a Week 11 bye. Kickoff is scheduled for 12:00 p.m. CT. The game will be regionally televised on FOX (WVUE FOX 8 locally in the New Orleans area)
- The Saints improved their all-time regular season record against Chicago to 18-13, extending their winning streak against the Bears to seven games, the longest by the Saints currently against an opponent.
- New Orleans won the turnover battle against Chicago 5-0, with the takeaways leading to ten points. S **Marcus Maye** had his second interception of the season and CB **Paulson Adebo** had three takeaways, recording two interceptions and a third quarter forced fumble/fumble recovery. The three takeaways were the most by a Saint since S Jay Bellamy's two interceptions and one fumble recovery on October 13, 2002 at Washington. Adebo now has a career-high six takeaways on the season, his first two fumble recoveries and four interceptions, setting a new career-high, tied for first in the NFL. With three pass defenses on the afternoon, Adebo has a career-high 11 passes defended on the season. Adebo also finished with seven tackles in the contest. The final takeaway was a fourth quarter fumble recovery by LB **Pete Werner**. New Orleans' five takeaways were the most by New Orleans since five interceptions in the 2020 regular season finale at Carolina (1/3/21).
- The New Orleans offense finished seven-for-14 (50.0%) on third down attempts.
- The Bears were held to only two touchdowns on four red zone trips and after the Saints gave up 14 points in the first half, they gave up only three points in the second half, keeping the Bears out of the end zone.
- The New Orleans offensive line did not surrender a sack for the first time in 2023. The offensive line has given up only two sacks in the last three games.
- QB **Derek Carr** completed 25-of-34 passes (73.5 percent) for 211 yards with two touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 108.8 passer rating. With the two touchdown passes, Carr moved into a tie for 35th all-time with former Bears signal-caller Jay Cutler. Finishing the day with 37,343 passing yards for his

career, Carr moved past QB Donovan McNabb for 28th all-time. Carr now has 3,408 completions for his career, tying Andy Dalton for 23rd all-time (total tabulated prior to Carolina's 3:05 CT contest against the Indianapolis Colts).

- Carr evened his record as a starter against the Bears to 2-2.
- Carr had an eight-yard touchdown pass to WR **Chris Olave** and a two-yard touchdown pass to QB **Taysom Hill**. Olave led the team in receiving with six receptions for 46 yards. Hill became the first player to have at least ten career rushing touchdowns, passing touchdowns and career receiving touchdowns since QB/HB Frank Gifford. Overall, Hill led New Orleans in rushing with 11 carries for 52 yards, had four receptions for 13 yards and tossed the three-yard go-ahead touchdown in the fourth quarter to TE **Juwan Johnson**. Hill's 20 receptions on the season are a career-high.
- Johnson had his most productive day of the season with five receptions for 29 yards, including his first scoring grab of 2023.
- RB **Alvin Kamara** had nine carries for 26 yards and caught four passes for 44 yards. With his four receptions, he surpassed Thurman Thomas for 23rd all-time among running backs.
- WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed** recorded three receptions for 22 yards, returned two punts 20 yards and brought back a kickoff for 24 yards. Shaheed now has 1,054 all-purpose yards after the first nine weeks of the 2023 season.
- Three Saints had an interception, the first time New Orleans had finished with three picks in a contest since September 26, 2021 at New England.
- LB **Demario Davis** led the team with ten tackles (eight solo) and a fourth quarter sack/forced fumble.
- DE **Cameron Jordan** made his 200th career start, the second Saint to ever start 200 regular season games, joining QB Drew Brees, and posted a season-high seven tackles (four solo), a stop for loss, two QB hits and a sack. Jordan's sack on QB Tyson Bagent marks the 47th different player he has dropped in his 13-season career.
- DT **Khalen Saunders** finished with five tackles (two solo), as well as seeing extensive action as a goal line blocking fullback.
- CB **Marshon Lattimore** finished with three tackles (two solo). Lattimore now has 301 career solo tackles, surpassing the 300 solo stop mark in his career.
- K **Blake Grupe** finished one-of-two on field goal tries, including a career-best 55-yarder and made both PAT attempts. All five of Grupe's kickoffs sailed into the end zone for touchbacks.
- P **Lou Hedley** punted four times for 164 yards with a 41.0 gross/net punting average and three dropped inside-the-20-yard line, including a fourth quarter punt that end out of bounds at the Chicago two-yard line.

- LS **Zach Wood** played in his 107th career game on Sunday, moving him into a tie with S Gene Atkins and LB Pat Swilling for 41st place on the club's games played list.

(Opening Statement) "Hard fought win. None of these are ever easy in our league and for anybody that ever thinks that you got an easy one, you are waiting to get your ass beat. So it was a good win for us. We're excited about the win. Moving forward and getting ready to go play Minnesota, so I'll take your questions."

(On the defense) "I think the takeaways were outstanding. (There) Wasn't a lot good that I saw defensively, but the takeaways were outstanding and that's a difference in the game. It is credit to our guys to go out and take the ball away. We talked about punching the ball out this week, we got a nice top down punch out. Some of the things that we emphasize were good to see. We still have to start faster defensively. So we have to figure that out. We have way too many mistakes early on in the game and that has to be better."

(On what the defense wasn't doing well) "Just not being in the right spot, not getting aligned properly. Just sloppy crap."

(On if he considered changing the defensive approach to bring more QB pressure) "No I wanted to play better. We brought some pressures. I thought that the Paulson's interception was on him (Tyson Bagent) was under pressure. It's easy to want to pressure but it's harder to pressure when everything's second and fourth, third and three, third and two. You don't have a lot of pressures on your call sheet necessarily in those situations. You have to create a little bit some longer down (and) distances and you get a chance to be a little bit more aggressive. But, all that being said, five takeaways put us in good position and we were able to get 24 points today, which is enough to get the win."

(On the decision to accept the holding penalty in the second quarter) "I think in that situation, it was going to be fourth and two, and quite honestly, I thought they'd be aggressive there and and go for it. I thought, well, we can back them up and hopefully get him to be more a fourth and longer yardage situation, force them to have to kick the field goal. It did not work. We did not get it done. But that was the thought process behind it."

(On the offensive drive at the end first half) "Well, wasn't a lot of time there. We had a couple of plays to try to get the ball down the field, obviously the last play of the half we're really trying to get the ball down the field and I guess Derek (Carr) got a little bit of pressure there and we felt like he had to get rid of the ball. So we didn't really get a chance to get the ball down the field. But look, there wasn't there wasn't a lot of time there to get chunks in yardage."

(On Lou Hedley punting to the three-yard line) "No, that's huge. The field position there was huge. The way that the game gets played on the two or three yard line is totally different than the way the game gets played on the 20-yard line. And so that was a huge play by him, backing them up we were able to get off the field there and change the field position."

(On Taysom Hill and his performance) "I thought he was really good. I thought our plan to utilize him was good and I thought he was effective when we utilized him. But they kind of had a little bit of a plan to try to load it up to stop him. But it's just the stress of every single play that it could be the one that pops. Really at the end the day for us to be able to close the game out like that down there inside the red area was big."

(On the decision to punt instead of attempting to kick the field goal in the fourth quarter) "All those options go through your mind. But I felt like trying to pin him down. Obviously, that's a long field goal and the percentages of making those aren't necessarily great and so, the thought process was, let's pin them down there in that situation and see if we can create some field position get the ball back in good field position for the offense."

(On his thought process to not kick the field goal) “Every minute of the game changes the thought process in terms of what you're thinking, in terms of your aggressiveness, whether you're going to go for it, kick the field goal, or try to plot them and pin them deep. Those are your three options and we chose to try to pin him down there.”

(On if it was halftime adjustments that caused the turnovers) “I think it was guys making plays, which was awesome to see. Paulson's (second half) interception was a great play by him. He played it exactly how he is supposed to play it. Marcus Maye's interception coming across the middle, hell of a play. Adebo's punchout was, it was beautiful to see. I think it was really just our guys making plays. First interception, I thought Paulson did a hell of a job on. Read it perfectly, was in the right spot, saw the quarterback, made a good break, and then went up high part of the ball. The runback sucked (laughter), but the interception was good.”

(On if he was disappointed with the consistency of the defense) “Well, look, I think overall, both sides of the ball I would have liked to see us be a little bit more consistent. I thought offensively, in the first half, I thought we moved the ball really well and there was consistency in what we were doing in the first half. Not quite as good in the second half. It's something that we got to go back and evaluate the tape, make the corrections that we need to make and then move forward from that. But I have seen more consistency out of the offense in the last month. That's been good to see.”

(On the Bears' quarterback scrambles) “There's a way that you have to rush a quarterback. If everybody just tries to go and win their one on one battle, then there's no structure to how you're rushing this guy and that's how quarterbacks escape. So we have to do a better job of understanding the rush plan and do a better job of making sure that we're all working together in the rush plan so when the quarterback does try to escape, then we have somebody there to get him down. So that has to be better, because that stinks right now.”

(On if there was a correction made to fix the QB scrambles) “We talked about it.”

(On if there were halftime adjustments) “Halftime adjustments are over freaking rated. Alright? Stop. Okay? Play better; coach better; execute; do your job. That is what it is about. Okay? So that's what the communication was at halftime. We did not come in there and just change the whole frickin game plan. Are we haven't done it any week up to this point. What we've done is we've called better calls, and we've executed better and we need to start doing that early on.”

(On Paulson Adebo) “Well, I think he's always had good instincts. Two years ago, I think, what he had three interceptions a couple years ago, not as much last year. Last year he was fighting through some injuries and stuff. He's healthy this year. I think overall from a secondary standpoint, I think our guys have done a nice job of technical football.”

(On the penalties coming down from previous weeks) “I think probably a little bit both. A little bit of both. I think our guys from a technique standpoint have been doing a little better.”

(On Chris Olave having the first touchdown) “That was awesome to see, made a great catch in the endzone was a huge play for us and a big confidence builder for him I think. It was good to see him come back and respond and yet I think there's still more out there for him. So we're going to keep pushing him and keep pushing him to get the best out of him. I think there's more there and I'm excited about seeing it.”

(On Olave's maturity off the field) “He's (an) extremely mature kid. He works his tail off. I'm glad he's on our team. I think he's going to be a big part of what we do as we move forward. He's an explosive weapon and he's going to be a big part of our football team.”

(On if he was surprised by the lack of separation by the receivers) “I guess I have to go back and kind of look a little bit and see kind of where we were at. You're talking about us offensively being able to create some separation? I thought we did some nice things in the passing game. But without really seeing the tape, I'll decline to comment too much on that.”

(On the Chicago's quarterback's performance) “[He played] way better than I wanted him to. I thought he did, honestly, with the exception of the turnovers, I thought he played really well. I thought he operated their offense extremely well. Obviously you could see him get into some checks and adjustments on the line of scrimmage based on what we were doing and showing. He looked like he

was poised in the pocket never really panicked. Took off when he needed to. So I was highly impressed with what I saw out of him.”

(On Taysom Hill making history) “I think that's pretty impressive. Right? Half the guys in a locker room would have no idea who Frank Gifford is. I think that's pretty impressive.”

(On the play progression that resulted in the touchdown pass from Hill to Juwan Johnson) “Well, look, I think everybody executed their job on that play. We're actually trying to get Bink [Khalen Saunders] a touchdown in the flat there and they did a nice job, but he actually took two in coverage, which allowed Juwan to get open in the back of the end zone. Taysom went through his progression, found Juwan and when you when you execute and you do the things that you're supposed to do, generally you get good results.”

QB DEREK CARR

(On back to back wins) "That is why we play the game. Being able to make corrections after a win (is easier than after a loss). We were able to string together two wins in a row after the terrible feeling that we had before the Colts game. Seeing the fruits of the conversations and the hard work payoff is a good feeling. We still have room to improve and need to do some things better, but to see us going in that direction is what we want to see."

(On the fast start and slow second half) "We won. At the end of the day, we won. This is professional football. Everyone is into numbers and fantasy football, but sometimes the defensive backs make plays or the defense gets in there. They made some plays in the second half early on that we didn't make, but I'm not overly concerned or thinking it's not fixable. They made plays at those moments when we came out in the second half to make it not feel as good as the first. I am fully confident in our group coming in tomorrow, especially after a win, to focus on what we can do better and get ready for next week."

(On the importance of getting Chris Olave involved) "Look, we're all human. We go through stuff. There is change. He's getting to know me and things go as players and in our personal lives. Sometimes you can be doing everything right and things don't go your way. He's still making big plays for us and making tough catches. To see him have a touchdown and a couple big plays for us was good. Like I have been saying since I got here, some days it's going to be that way. Whether it is Chris, Mike (Thomas), Rashid (Shaheed) or Alvin (Kamara) getting the ball a lot in a given game, I am just going to read the play and try my best to make it happen. It just happened to go that way for Chris today, but it was good timing I think."

(On the maturity of Olave) "He has been unbelievable. He has handled everything with such class. Every time we come to work he's texting me, facetimeing me saying, "I got you on this" or, "I like this route". To see him be able to compartmentalize is really unbelievable. He's a young player. Again, sometimes in this league, we don't give young guys a chance to grow, develop, and go through their process. I think he is going to be a tremendous player for a long time, and the city of New Orleans should be very happy to have Chris as one of their starting wide receivers. He is the ultimate pro, he loves football, is a great teammate, and does anything you ask of him."

(On the turnover differential) "It's one of those things. I could maybe force a tight window throw here and there, but at the end of the day playing with this defense, I know over time if I can take care of the football that the turnover differential will turn into wins. You always see at the end of the year, the teams at the top have a big takeaway differential, and the teams at the bottom do not. I just want to be as efficient and clean as possible. There will be games that are tight. When they are tight, I have got to take care of the ball and give us a chance. When I need to make that throw, I will make that. There were a couple times today where I did not have to do that because I know what is happening on the other side of the ball. The ultimate goal is to win the football game and it takes all three phases playing together. I am just trying and doing that to my best ability to help DA (Dennis Allen) and those guys out."

(On Bears' game plan resulting in quiet day for Michael Thomas) "There was a few opportunities, but some plays where he was featured, they had a certain coverage. I know Mike, and that was probably a frustrating thing for him as a player. Hopefully, he knows they were doubling him in the red zone which led to Chris and Juwan's (Johnson) touchdowns. Just his presence and who he is helped us win this game today. It won't be on the stat sheet or show up in fantasy points, but just his presence and who he is helped us win today."

(On the last play before half) “We wanted to get as much as we could and try to set up a field goal. But I saw how they were playing with a sideline defense, so I just wanted our guys to go and thought we would have to throw the Hail Mary. With all the guys on the sideline for them, there would be less people in the end zone. It wasn’t something we talked about. We ended up trying the Hail Mary but they got pressure and I had to check it down. “

(On the offensive line play and allowing zero sacks) “They have been unbelievable. There are always things they want to clean up, but I am trying my best also to not take sacks because that hurts the team at the end of the day. Some people may not like it when I have to “dirt” a ball, but we just have to make the right plays. Our offensive line is doing such a great job and allowing me to go through progressions and move defenders. The first play of the game I had time to move a guy with my eyes and that was not anything that me and Chris (Olave) did special. That is a credit to the offensive line allowing us to play that way.”

(On Taysom Hill’s impact and versatility) “Today we got so much man coverage. Usually we do not get much man coverage and when we do, it is a good play for us. That is not just us, that is across the league. There were playing some man and that is when Taysom got his touchdown wide open. He has been so good in his role here for so long. Back when I was watching from afar and Drew (Brees) was playing quarterback, I used to wonder why they would take Drew off the field. Then I got here and it was like, “I see why. This guy is pretty good”. He is great at what he does for us. He is the ultimate competitor, a great friend, and has been amazing to me since I got here. I celebrate him every chance I get, because guys like him don’t come around all the time. A guy that can go from tight end to running back to blocking on special teams to punt return to playing quarterback to playing receiver. That just doesn’t happen. He is one of my favorite teammates and the ultimate competitor”.

(On Khalel Saunders attracting attention in red zone) “Hilarious. I have played with my fair share of good players in skill positions, but I have never seen someone attract that much attention on a play. Him and Michael Thomas attracting double teams today. They attract attention and now I have to put #99 in that category too”.

QB TAYSOM HILL

(On if he has heard of Frank Gifford) “I’ve heard because the stats guys told me about these stats. I have heard of him. Yes, of course.”

(On joining him in the record books) “I look back at my career and I certainly didn’t think it would have gone the way that it has. It’s overwhelming when I hear things like that. I have a lot of gratitude to be with this program and play with coaches that are creative enough to give me the opportunity. It is really a whole lot of gratitude.”

(On the touchdown pass to Juwan Johnson) “They zoned it off. We were trying to get (Khalel Saunders) in the flat. He was covered. We were trying to get Foster (Moreau) on the backside. He took two and Juwan (Johnson) was running free in the back of the end zone. It was just a progression-based play. It worked out.”

(On if he expected two defenders to be covering Saunders) “I don’t know. He tracks a lot of eyes and a lot of attention. Even in the run game, they are worried about where he is because they don’t want to get hit by him.”

(On Saunders’ difference in energy when it’s coming to him) “I don’t know. We had a fair amount of stuff with him in this week. I think he was more concerned about where he was lining up. Are we shifting right now? What are we doing? He is a great teammate. The thing I love most about him is his energy. Anytime you get him in the huddle players feed off that. That was certainly the case.”

(On the creativity lately) “I feel like the first quarter of the season we have been so close. You look at a few drives and it was a penalty here killed the drive. I think what we have seen is that we have had penalty-free drives. We have had the ability to keep the chains moving. As you alluded to, it gives you a lot of confidence. As a play-caller, we also have a lot more opportunities to call more plays on the call sheet. The creativity that you are alluding to has always been there. We have been sustaining drives, which builds a lot of confidence. We have been a confident unit the last few weeks for sure.”

(On if he feels like this is his best season) “I don’t know. Personally, I don’t get caught up on what the stats are and what I’m doing. At the end of the day, we are just trying to win football games. We are trying to take advantage of every opportunity that I get and hopefully I can contribute to winning football games.”

DE CAMERON JORDAN

(On how start number 200 felt) "Like I should have had three sacks and only left with one. There is always room for more. I think the way our DBs got greedy this game that there would be room for some left over. Demario Davis finished the game for us. I thought I was getting a sack. He got a sack and even better, he got a (forced) fumble. He sealed that. We love to see 56 in his super mode. He started off preaching saying that this game was necessary. He meant each and every word. That is how you come down with it. I have nothing but high praise the way our DBs decided to start jumping routes. Paulson (Adebo) was coming out like a thief in the night. That man was picking everything. It is impressive to see a defense go out and get a win like that after the first half. There was 14 points put up on us the first half and that's unlike us. I'm still upset about that part, but the second half was great."

(On if he can categorize the slow start) "We emphasized fast start the whole week, so it couldn't have been what we preached. They were doing some unorthodox quicks that was working. We had the quarterback escape the pocket a couple of times. Those were probably their longest rushes of the game. That is something on the D-line that we put on us. We are emphasizing each and every day to eliminate that."

(On Adebo's day) "I think he is a heck of an athlete. He decided to jump all these routes and be amazing today. He was everywhere. Our DB's did such a great job. A major shoutout to Paulson Adebo out of Stanford, which just doesn't feel right."

(On the turnover ratio this season) "As long as it means equivalent to more wins. At the end of the day we are going to be judged by how many wins and not how many takeovers we have. So, if we have 75 sacks at the end of the season and we don't have enough wins to get to the playoffs, then what does it matter. If we have 45 interceptions and don't make the playoffs, then what does it matter. If we have three interceptions and we make the playoffs and have a chance to go to the Super Bowl, then that's all that matters. At the end of the day the way these guys are playing and how our defense showed up in the second half, then that is how you get a win."

(On getting a sack with Matt Ryan in the building) "I started my day by hitting Matt (jokingly on the field pregame). I saw him on the sideline and gave him a quick pop. Just a little jolt. Just to say "Hey, I miss you" We went from there. Then I got a few pops on (Tyson) Bagent. We got a couple of hits on him early. We wanted to make him a pocket passer. It sort of stinks as a rusher because you are trying to hit this turn and throw yourself down and sort of play this game of don't let him escape the pocket. Then, he escapes the pocket and you get yelled at. It is what it is. That's a game that we were brought into. It wouldn't have changed with Justin Fields in there because we know that he is just as elusive of a runner. It is onward and upward."

CB PAULSON ADEBO

(On how it feels to have a specific role in the victory) "It feels great. I would not be able to do it without my teammates. Obviously, rush and coverage seems to go together. Everyone is saying great play, but the fact of the matter is our pass rushers are doing such a great job throughout the duration of the game making the quarterback uncomfortable."

(On the interceptions) "I was just trying to read the quarterback's eyes. I was trying to be aggressive on the ball. We've been harping on trying to get takeaways."

(On when he knows he has a shot at an interception) "I think just being a playmaker and reading the quarterback's eyes. I'm seeing when his hand comes off the ball and just trying to jump the route and make a play."

(On the punchout) "It's also something we have been harping on. Coach has been harping on attacking the ball. We are just trying to see the ball and punching it so it will come out. I'm glad I was able to."

(On if he tried to bait the quarterback) "I think it is just great play calls. The coaches are just putting us in the position to make plays. Depending on the down and distance, I feel like they had us in a good call. We just needed to execute our technique and make a play on the ball."

(On building off this game) "You just try to take one game at a time. You just try to get locked in every single play. There are some things that I have to fix and there are some things that we have to fix as a defense. I think we just need to move forward and stay as focused as possible and let the good games carry over."

(On if he feels locked in the last few weeks) "I try to be locked in every week. The results were good this week. Obviously, I need to go look at the film. Sometimes, it feels better than it is. Sometimes it feels worse than it is. I just try to have the same approach every week and try to put my best foot forward."

(On the overall game today) “An update on Khari Blasingame, he is in concussion protocol. We will see what that bodes for this week, but obviously, it is going to be tough to get back out there for him. Just hope he’s okay and hope he’s doing fine. Overall for the game, I thought we took the ball, decided to take the ball with the coin toss there. The guys did a really good job of taking the ball down the field. I thought the first 15 (scripted plays) were really good. Obviously, we scored a touchdown there. That was excellent. We got a four-and-out on defense. Then, had that one interception from there. Really in the first half I thought our offense did a good job operating. We got some good yards in there from a bunch of different ways. Running the football was a big goal for us today, and I thought we accomplished that goal. Stopping the run was also a big goal for us, and I thought we did that as well. When you look at the third downs in the first half for the defense it wasn’t good. They were five-of-six. Didn’t do a good enough job on that. Came back in the second half, and they ended up 7-of-14. I thought we did a good job with that, adjusting. The players did a good job of executing to give ourselves a chance to win in that situation there. Really the story of the day is just takeaways. It is hard to win (losing the ball). The League is pretty even in most spots. It’s hard to win when you have -5. Again, that’s a whole team thing. It’s us protecting it, protecting the quarterback, getting it on defense and us doing a better job of taking the ball away on D. That is really where the story was. I loved the fight of the guys at the end there. (The) Defense gave us a chance there at the very end with those stops we had and with the missed field goal they had. With that I will open it for questions.”

(On QB Tyson Bagent and the turnovers) “I’m going to have to look at it. What I saw out there was they play man coverage. That’s what they do. They’re a tight coverage there. We were throwing it into tight windows, and we have to do a good job with our decision-making. That’s where it is. Again, I’ll look at the tape and see exactly what they were doing. Getting that stuff to the first, that’s the No. 1 job of a quarterback – protecting the football.”

(On if there were opportunities to win at the end of the game) “We made stops on downs on defense. We had time. We still had time. We still had time, and the guys were still fighting and battling, and because of that, we made it a game at the end. I really believe we had a chance at the end there.”

(On the difference in the defense from the first to the second half) “Just the third downs. The reason they kept those drives. We were protecting the run great. We were tackling good. We were doing all those things well. During that first half, the only thing they had on the plus side was the third downs. Like I said, they had five-of-six, and I believe two of them were in the red zone. That’s what we needed to get corrected. We made the adjustment. They did a nice job.”

(On QB Justin Fields’ status): “Yeah. He’s day-to-day. We will find out more tomorrow. We’ll see where it is. He started throwing, which is a positive. We’ll see where it is in terms of his functionality.”

(On if he hopes Fields will play Thursday): “We’ll see where it is. We’ll see.”

(On how the team handled the week with many outside distractions): “I would say really good. Obviously, if we would have won the game, I would have said great. It’s not great because we lost. Our guys hung together. They always do. They practiced well. They came out ready to play today. Again, if we get the ball right, we would be great today. That’s where it is. The guys were physical. They finished every play, and they played our style, which is the style we want to play.”

(On CB Tyrique Stevenson’s injury): “We will see where he is. I know it was a lower leg injury. We will see where he is tomorrow.”

(On the key to the run game being successful early in the game) “Again, they shift their front a little bit here and there. It’s an overload on that one side we were running to the whole time. My hat’s off to them. They made the adjustment, and it wasn’t as effective as it was. Again, I thought we did a really good job over the course of the day running the football.”

(On Bagent’s play) “(Bagent) had some really nice plays. It wasn’t just the QB scrambles. There was a disconnect from the runner a couple of times where he kept the ball on those. That was cool to see him on the edge there and also the keepers. He had some waggles and boots where he got on the edge and had a chance to go run-pass option. He did a good job with that.”

(On the plan for defensive end Montez Sweat): “Just play (Montez Sweat) on the third downs, play him on in the two-minute. Again, my hat’s off to the defense. They did a really nice job at the end of

the half during that two-minute situation. (The Saints) still had some time (left), had some timeouts. Our guys did a really good job with that.”

(On how he thought Sweat played) “He looked good. He had a couple of good pressures there. He is getting his feet wet, different style of defense, different style of terminology. For him to come in and play that many plays was cool.”

(On getting Sweat’s extension done yesterday) “It’s extremely important. Ryan (Poles) and his staff did an awesome job working through that and getting that done in a timely fashion. We’re all excited. When you add a pass rusher to your defense and to your franchise, that’s a big deal of us going into the future.”

(On how close they are to being where they want to be as a team) “This is evidence we’re very close. Being -5 in the turnover margin and keeping it that close, the ability for us to show our style. Our style is to run the football, stop the run, be physical. We just have to get the ball right.”

(On Bagent’s experience): “In terms of his operation and knowing the offense and operating the huddle, getting in and out of the huddle, for a guy to come in there as a rookie like that, it was pretty impressive when you think about it. He’s had really good moments in the starts that he’s had. He has got to learn. The most important thing Tyson can do now that the performance is over is to learn from his performance and to get better. To partner up with the coaches, the offensive coordinator and myself and look at those plays where he needs to improve and look at the good plays. There are a lot of good plays out there that he had in the first half, first quarter today. He has to build off of both of those things.”

(On the Saints offense being on the Chicago side of the field for the entirety of the fourth quarter and having a chance at the end of the game): “Yeah, we always do think we had a chance. Just one takeaway on defense to give ourselves a short field or put ourselves in scoring position, or a kick return or punt return, whatever that might be to really flip the field. Because of the turnovers they were playing around mid-field most of the day. That happens sometimes. That’s called sudden change. Our defense did a great job of rising up to the occasion on most of those occasions during the course of the game, getting a three-and-out, making them punt, stopping them on downs. This gives our team a chance.”

(On the offensive line penalties): “You go back and look at those. Obviously, the false starts are the false starts. We have to clean those up, but the holdings you have to look at them. Sometimes it happens when you extend plays on the perimeter. When you’re extending plays as a quarterback, it happens sometimes. I’ll look and evaluate all those penalties and see what we think.”

(On an explanation on the facemask on Velus Jones Jr.) “It was a facemask. He grabbed it.”

(On learning from penalties like the facemask): “You just cannot do that. We’re pro football players and coaches. We know we can’t grab the facemask”

(On deciding to challenge the spot early in the game) “Upstairs, Harry’s [Harrison Fried] upstairs, and we are always looking at it. I thought it was spotted short to begin with. We looked at it on replay. We had enough time. It was early, so we just threw it. We had a good look at it. It was overturned. It was good by the league.”

(On what Fields brings to the team) “The experience factor. Him playing all those games. Certainly, the experience factor. He’s operated in this offense. He’s had some good weeks prior to this in the Washington game. He’s had some good weeks this year. We’re excited to get him back when he comes back. The QB runs are viable there too, the perimeter’s getting under attack more. That’s what he brings.”

(On the difference between his play during the first three quarters to that in the fourth quarter) “I thought that I did a good job of controlling the game. I thought that we did a good job of controlling the game, managing the play clock, especially with the atmosphere that they always tell you about when you come here to play the Saints. I thought that we managed that well. I thought that we took advantage of a lot of things. Really, it just all comes down to myself in that last quarter, being able to do a better job of taking care of the ball better. Coach talks about it every single day how important it is to take care of the ball; and I didn’t do a good job of that. So, that’s basically just me there in that last quarter.”

(On the interceptions in the final quarter) “I think it was good on their part (and) bad on my part. It was tight coverage. They made a couple of really good plays. Hats off to them. Once again, I probably just have to go somewhere else with the ball. That’s on me.”

(On if the offense was stalling and he was trying to force a play) “Yeah, I think that it was all on me forcing a couple of plays there. You can’t afford to take plays off in the NFL because it can come back to bite you. You have to be sharp on every play.”

(On five turnovers today, yet still close to winning the game) “I thought that our team played extremely well, which is why it’s so embarrassing, just because it’s one score game. (And) to lose the turnover battle by that amount, it’s embarrassing. It’s part of the game. I am just looking forward to building and learning from this experience.”

(On his thoughts on his play during the absence of Justin Fields) “At the end of the day, I thought that I did a lot of good things. I thought that (there is a lot to work on) at the end of the day. I am blessed beyond measure. I can’t believe the position that I am in. I had an extreme amount of fun with all of the guys having my back the way that they did. For me going forward, nothing changes. I will continue to prepare as if I am starting every game. I am looking forward to it.”

(On if he knows what to work on moving forward) “Of course, repletion, the mother of all learners. The best way to learn is to be thrown into the fire, so to speak. I take a lot out of this experience.

(On how to bounce back on Thursday if he has to play) “I think there is only one way to, and that is just to continue to do what I have been doing preparation-wise, I think that is the only thing that there is to do. I don’t really know what else I would do. (I need) to just do what I’ve been doing preparation-wise, and do a better job of taking care of the football.”

(On the reason for the interceptions) “I think that I was late on the one to (Darnell) Mooney. I think that I was on time on the one to Tyler (Scott). It was good coverage, (but the ball was) a little bit behind him, which is all me.”
