**THE MATCHUP**

The Saints go back out on the road for the second week in a row, when they take part in an international showcase to face the Minnesota Vikings at London's Tottenham Hotspur Stadium on Sunday, October 2, in a contest that will be nationally televised on the NFL Network (WWL 4 locally) at 8:30 a.m. CT.

While the Vikings lead the all-time series 19-12 in the regular season and 3-1 in the postseason, the matchups and results between the clubs have featured some of the most thrilling and pivotal moments in each of their storied histories.

On Sunday, the Saints dropped a 22-14 decision at Carolina. Despite the setback, several of the team's younger players enjoyed promising afternoons that provide an impetus for New Orleans to get back on track.

Offensively, rookie WR **Chris Olave**, one of the club's two first round picks, led New Orleans in receiving with nine grabs for 147 yards, including a catch of 38 yard to start a possession late in the fourth quarter that eventually led to a touchdown. Olave currently leads New Orleans with 17 grabs for 268 yards (15.8 avg.).

Overall on offense, the Saints were victimized by two turnovers prior to the third on the last play of the game that the Panthers converted into ten points. However, the Saints showed promise when scored touchdowns on their two red zone attempts.

Defensively, the Saints only allowed only one Panthers red zone possession and only allowed the Carolina offense to convert 4-of-14 (28.6%) third down attempts.

Second-year LB **Pete Werner** continues to make plays all over the field in what shows promise to be a breakout campaign. After a club-best 11 stop effort, the former Ohio State standout leads the team with 31 tackles, tied for fifth in the NFL (press box statistics). Two of his contests have featured double-digit stops.

In addition to the consistent play from Werner, veteran defenders **Demario Davis** and **Cameron Jordan** each recorded sacks in the first half. With Jordan's 108th career sack, he moved into the top 25 on the NFL's all-time list.

**This Week In The NFC South:** The Atlanta Falcons will host the Cleveland Browns, the Panthers will host the Arizona Cardinals, while the Tampa Bay Buccaneers welcome in the Kansas City Chiefs on Sunday Night Football.

## **THE HEAD COACHES**

**Dennis Allen** was hired as the 17th head coach in New Orleans Saints history on February 8, 2022. Now in his 27th year coaching and 21st in the NFL, Allen has spent 13 seasons in New Orleans in two separate stints, including the six-and-a-half campaigns (2015-21) as the team's defensive coordinator prior to being promoted to head coach. He succeeds Sean Payton, who coached the team for 16 seasons, including the 2009 campaign, when Allen was secondary coach and ended with the Super Bowl XLIV championship. When Allen took control of a Black and Gold defense in Week 11 of the 2015 season that was ranked 32nd both in opponent net yards per game and opponent points per game, he methodically molded a unit that has finished in the top 10 in both categories each of the last two years, effectively synchronizing with the team's offensive and special teams units to produce five consecutive winning seasons (2017-present) and four straight division titles and playoff berths (2017-20). From 2017 to the present, New Orleans is the only defense in the NFL to rank in the top five in the National Football League in both opponent rushing yards per game and sacks.

Before rejoining the Saints coaching staff in 2015, Allen served as head coach of the Oakland Raiders from 2012-14 and as defensive coordinator of the Denver Broncos in 2011. Prior to his first stint in New Orleans from 2006-10, Allen was also an assistant with the Atlanta Falcons from 2002-05, where he received his NFL coaching start.

Allen played safety at Texas A&M from 1992-95, where he started the final 21 games of his college career before being signed as an undrafted free agent by the Buffalo Bills in 1996. Prior to entering the National Football League coaching ranks in 2002, Allen served as a graduate assistant at his alma mater from 1996-99 and as secondary coach at the University of Tulsa from 2000-2001. He earned a bachelor of business administration degree and a master's in kinesiology from Texas A&M.

Raised in Hurst, Texas, Allen and his wife Alisson have a daughter, Layla and a son, Garrison.

**Kevin O'Connell** was named the tenth head coach in Minnesota Vikings history on February 16, 2022. O'Connell joined the Vikings as a first-time head coach after serving the past two seasons as the offensive coordinator for the Los Angeles Rams, where he guided them to a victory over the Cincinnati Bengals in Super Bowl LVI. Prior to joining the Rams, he worked in Washington as a quarterbacks coach in 2017-18 and offensive coordinator in 2019. In his time as an offensive coordinator, O'Connell has coached one Super Bowl MVP, two Pro Bowlers, one All-Pro and one PFWA All-Rookie Team member. He also worked one season with the San Francisco 49ers in 2016 and one with the Cleveland Browns in 2015.

O'Connell was originally selected in the third round (94th pick) of the 2008 NFL Draft by the New England Patriots out of San Diego State. He played one season for the Patriots before being claimed off of waivers by the Detroit Lions during the 2009 preseason before being traded to the New York Jets for a seventh-round draft pick. O'Connell then spent time with the Miami Dolphins, enjoyed a second stint with the Jets and also was a member of the San Diego Chargers before his playing career ended in 2012 and he started his NFL coaching career two years later in Washington.

Born in Carlsbad, California, O'Connell was a quarterback and four-year captain at San Diego State. He and his wife, Leah, have two sons, Kaden and Kolten, and a daughter, Quinn.

## **SAINTS-VIKINGS CONNECTIONS**

New Orleans defensive end **Cameron Jordan** was born in Minneapolis while his father Steve, who was a seventh round draft pick of Minnesota in 1982 out of Brown, played tight end for the Vikings from 1982-1994. Steve was a three-time All-Pro, six-time Pro Bowl selection from 1986-91, for whom he played his entire career, finishing with totals of 498 receptions for 6,307 yards and 28 touchdowns and was named one of the 50 greatest Vikings of all-time. He went into the Vikings Ring of Honor in 2019...New Orleans guard **Wyatt Davis** was a third round draft pick of the Vikings in 2021...Vikings punter **Ryan Wright** handled punting duties at Tulane from 2018-21...Saints offensive lineman **Lewis Kidd** prepped at Totino-Grace (Fridley, Minn.) HS...Minnesota Offensive Coordinator **Wes Phillips**' late grandfather, Bum, served as head coach of the Saints from 1981-85, while his father Wade, was defensive coordinator during the same period and took on interim head coaching duties for the final four contests of the 1985 campaign....Minnesota Quarterbacks Coach **Chris O'Hara** served on the Jacksonville Jaguars coaching staff from in 2020 under Saints Offensive Line Coach **Doug Marrone**, who was head coach...New Orleans practice squad running back **Latavius Murray** played in Minnesota from 2017-18. Vikings practice squad linebacker **Eric Wilson** played for the Vikings from 2017-20...Minnesota quarterback **Nick Mullens** played at the University of Southern Mississippi...Vikings Wide Receivers Coach **Keenan McCardell** served as Marrone's wideouts coach in Jacksonville from 2017-20...New Orleans Offensive Coordinator **Pete Carmichael** and Vikings Inside Linebackers Coach **Greg Manusky** served on the same San Diego Chargers coaching staff from 2002-05...Minnesota College Scout/Regional **Pat Roberts** previously served as the head strength coach and offensive line coach at Millsaps College in Jackson, Mississippi...Vikings Assistant Director of Sports Performance **Derik Keyes** is a Laurel, Miss. native who played at Louisiana-Lafayette and had coaching stints at his both alma mater and the University of South Alabama...Minnesota wide receiver **Justin Jefferson** prepped at Destrehan (La.) HS and played at Louisiana State University, where he was a high school teammate of Saints practice squad wide receiver **Kirk Merritt**...Merritt and Vikings tight end **Johnny Mundt** were college teammates at Oregon in 2014...Vikings tight end **Irv Smith Jr.** is the son of former Saints tight end **Irv Smith Sr.** and prepped at Brother Martin High School...Vikings Assistant Defensive Backs Coach **Roy Anderson** served as a defensive analyst at LSU in 2019...Vikings guard **Ed Ingram** played at LSU from 2017-21...New Orleans center/guard **Cesar Ruiz** and Vikings safety **Josh Metellus** were college teammates at the University of Michigan...Vikings defensive end **Jonathan Bullard** played at the University of Florida with Saints

safety **Marcus Maye**...New Orleans cornerback **P.J. Williams** and quarterback **Jameis Winston** were teammates with Vikings running back **Dalvin Cook** during the 2014 campaign at Florida State...New Orleans Assistant Head Coach/Special Teams Coordinator **Darren Rizzi** and Vikings Offensive Line Coach **Chris Kuper** served on the same coaching staff with the Miami Dolphins from 2016-18. Rizzi also served on the same Dolphins staff with Vikings Defensive Backs Coach **Daronte Jones** in Miami from 2016-17. Jones served on the Nicholls State coaching staff in 2002, as defensive coordinator at Franklin (La.) HS in 2003 and as defensive coordinator at LSU in 2021. Rizzi tutored Vikings kicker **Greg Joseph** as a rookie in the 2018 preseason with the Dolphins. Saints wide receiver **Jarvis Landry** and Joseph were teammates with the Cleveland Browns in 2018...New Orleans Pro Scout **Tosen Eyetsemitan** and Vikings General Manager **Kwesi Adofo-Mensah** worked together in the same Cleveland front office in 2020...Vikings defensive end **Danielle Hunter** both played at Louisiana State University...New Orleans offensive lineman **Calvin Throckmorton** and Minnesota linebacker **Troy Dye** were college teammates at Oregon...Saints safety **Tyrann Mathieu** played at Louisiana State with Vikings cornerback **Patrick Peterson** in 2010 and the pair were later teammates in the same secondary again with the Arizona Cardinals from 2013-17...New Orleans kicker **Wil Lutz** and Minnesota defensive back **Chandon Sullivan** were college teammates at Georgia State...New Orleans Assistant Special Teams Coach **Phil Galiano** tutored Minnesota long snapper **Andrew DePaola** both in College at Rutgers and with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers from 2012-13. Winston and DePaola were teammates in Tampa Bay from 2015-16...Minnesota cornerback **Cameron Dantzler** prepped at St. Thomas Aquinas (Hammond, La.) HS and then played at Mississippi State, where he was a college teammate of New Orleans defensive back **J.T. Gray**...New Orleans wide receiver **Marquez Callaway** and defensive tackle **Shy Tuttle** played with Vikings running back **Ty Chandler** at the University of Tennessee...This week's FOX color analyst **Mark Sanchez** played quarterback for Saints Head Coach **Dennis Allen**, when Allen was head coach of the Oakland Raiders in 2012.



## **SERIES HISTORY**

Minnesota leads the regular season series, having won 19 of 31 contests since the teams first met on October 13, 1968 at Tulane Stadium and four of five postseason meetings; the Black and Gold won that first matchup 20-17. The Saints would not beat the Vikings again until Sept. 3, 1978, losing six straight contests in the interim. Though the Vikings have a firm grasp of the overall series record, the Saints have fared much better since 2009. The teams have met on nine occasions since then, six times in the regular season and three in the postseason and New Orleans has captured six, including a 52-33 win on Christmas Day, 2020, when RB **Alvin Kamara** tied NFL records with six rushing touchdowns and six overall touchdowns. The Saints and Vikings have met five times in the playoffs, including the Black and Gold's first ever postseason game in 1987, which the Vikings seized at the Superdome, 44-10. The third playoff meeting proved to be the charm, however, as the two clubs met at the Superdome on Jan. 24, 2010 for the NFC Championship as New Orleans defeated the Vikings 31-17 to send the Saints to Super Bowl XLIV.

## **LAST MEETING**

**Saints 52, Minnesota Vikings 33, December 25, 2020 at Mercedes-Benz Superdome** – The Saints made their Christmas debut, getting off to a hot start in the running game and never let up, the backbone for a record-breaking performance that punched their ticket for their fourth consecutive NFC South division title.

Sparked by a 40-yard rushing touchdown from RB **Alvin Kamara**, the Saints marched 75 yards on their first possession to take a quick 7-0 lead.

Minnesota displayed an ability to move the ball on their first possession, as they ran down the field on eight plays and 75 yards, ending with a 15-yard rushing touchdown by RB **Dalvin Cook** to tie the score.

However, New Orleans quickly drove down the field, starting with RB **Ty Montgomery's** 33-yard kickoff return and ending with a one-yard rushing touchdown by Kamara to take a 14-7 lead.

After the Saints defense forced the first punt of the contest, but backed up at their four-yard line, QB **Drew Brees** connected with 19-yard completions with QB **Taysom Hill** and rookie WR **Juwan Johnson** and RB **Latavius Murray** had runs of 21 and 11 yards to set up a 30-yard field goal by K **Wil Lutz** to give the Saints a 17-7 lead.

Facing the early second quarter deficit, the Vikings offense found some success on their next possession and put together a 75-yard scoring drive that was capped by a

four-yard run by RB **Mike Boone**.

Brees was then picked off by the Vikings on the next possession, but the defense picked him up in forcing a three-and-out, led by a third down sack split by S **Malcolm Jenkins** and DT **David Onyemata** to force a punt.

The Saints then took possession at the Vikings 46-yard line and seven plays later, Kamara rushed five yards for his third touchdown of the contest

At the start of the third quarter, the New Orleans defense forced a punt, but Vikings IB **Hardy Nickerson** intercepted a ball that went off the hands of WR **Emmanuel Sanders** in Saints territory, setting the Vikings up at their 18-yard line. Three plays later, Vikings QB **Kirk Cousins** connected with TE **Irv Smith Jr.** on a two-yard touchdown, to put Minnesota within four points at 24-20 following an unsuccessful extra point attempt by K **Dan Bailey**.

New Orleans then enjoyed a productive ten-play, 74-yard drive that ended with a six-yard rushing touchdown by Kamara, his fourth of the contest to put the Saints up by 11 until Cousins and Smith connected on a one-yard scoring connection.

New Orleans then put the game away with rushing touchdowns from Kamara and Hill. Late in the contest, Kamara tied the NFL record for rushing touchdowns and total touchdowns with his sixth rushing score of the evening on a three-yard run after Brees connected with TE **Adam Trautman** for a 41-yard gain.

## **GAME SUMMARIES**

**Week 1: Saints 27, Falcons 26; September 11, 2022 @ Mercedes-Benz Stadium** – A new coach. A bunch of guys coming back from injuries. A 16-point deficit in the fourth quarter.

None of it flustered the New Orleans Saints, who pulled off a stunning comeback Sunday.

Wil Lutz kicked a 51-yard field goal with 19 seconds remaining after Jameis Winston guided a pair of lightning-quick touchdown drives, giving the Saints a 27-26 victory over the Atlanta Falcons in Dennis Allen's coaching debut. "It was exciting," Winston said with a smile. "We've just got to find a way to get there quicker."

After struggling offensively through most of the season opener, the Saints finally found their rhythm. Winston threw for 269 yards after going down last season on Halloween with a knee injury. Michael Thomas hauled in a pair of fourth-quarter TD passes in his first game since the 2020 season, having missed an entire campaign with complications from an ankle injury.

And Lutz delivered at the end, showing he's fully recovered from a core issue that kept him out for all of 2021.

## GAME SUMMARIES

### CONTINUED FROM PREVIOUS PAGE-WEEK 1 AT ATLANTA

"I'm happy with our resilience," Winston said. "We never gave up."

Winston hooked up with Thomas on touchdown passes of 3 and 9 yards. The Saints converted one 2-point try, but failed on the other, leaving the Falcons clinging to a 26-24 lead.

New Orleans got the ball back one more time, taking over at its own 20 with 48 seconds remaining and no timeouts. No problem.

Winston connected on a 40-yard pass to Jarvis Landry and a 17-yarder to Juwan Johnson to set up Lutz's winning field goal.

A personal foul on the Saints gave the Falcons a chance to pull out the victory, but Younghoe Koo's 63-yard field goal attempt was blocked as the clock ran out.

It was a stirring start to the Allen era.

Sean Payton, who coached the team for 15 years and led New Orleans to its lone Super Bowl title, surprisingly stepped down after last season.

His defensive coordinator got the job, even though Allen's first head coaching stint resulted in a record of 8-28 with the Raiders in 2012-14.

Make it 9-28.

"I hope they're not all like that," Allen said. "Look, our team is tough and gritty. That's what I love about 'em. That's exactly the way they played in this game. It wasn't perfect. We've got a ton of things to clean up."

The Falcons, who have seemingly never recovered from squandering a 28-3 lead in the 2017 Super Bowl, added another meltdown to their resume in their first game of the post-Matt Ryan era.

Falcons running back Cordarrelle Patterson rushed for a career-high 120 yards, including a 5-yard scoring burst, and Marcus Mariota made his first start since 2019 as Ryan's replacement.

Mariota threw for 215 yards and added 72 on the ground, highlight by a 2-yard touchdown run.

But in the end, the Falcons let what seemed like a sure victory get away.

"You guys wrote our obituary back in May and you'll continue to write our obituary," second-year coach Arthur Smith grumbled to reporters. "Who cares? We've got 16 games to learn from this and get better."

Winston was sacked four times by a team that had a league-low 18 sacks a year ago. He passed for just 24 yards in the first half, but made all the throws when it really counted.

Landry had seven catches for 114 yards, and Thomas finished with five catches for 57 yards.

"It was a blessing to be back out there with the guys," said Thomas, who had an NFL-record 149 receptions in 2019 but was playing just his eighth game since then.

### SECOND CHANCE

Lutz was kicking himself after his first field goal attempt from 44 yards hit the left upright.

He bounced back to make a 49-yarder before connecting on the game-winner.

"Obviously, coming off a miss is tough," Lutz said. "But that's what we signed up to do. I'm grateful the defense gave me a chance to get back out there and the offense put me in position to make the kick. It feels really good."

### PROMISING STARTS

Both teams got plenty of production from their first-round rookie receivers.

Drake London, the No. 8 overall selection, led the Falcons with five catches for 74 yards.

Chris Olave, the No. 11 choice by the Saints, had three receptions for 41 yards and hauled in another catch on New Orleans' successful 2-point conversion.

**Week 2: Buccaneers 20, Saints 10; September 18, 2022 @ Caesars Superdome** – The New Orleans Saints may have been in position to break Tampa Bay.

Or, maybe not, because it's impossible to say definitively what "may" have happened if "this" or "that" had been successful or unsuccessful. All that is known for sure is what actually did happen.

And what happened for the Saints, in a 20-10 loss to the Buccaneers on Sunday in the Caesars Superdome, was this: A golden opportunity was lost in the third quarter, one which reverberated and raised the "what if" temperature by an extra 100 degrees in a game where points were at a premium due to the stinginess of two high-level defenses. On the drive after Tampa Bay tied the score at 3 with a 47-yard field goal, New Orleans opened its next drive at its 25 following a touchback. And the Saints went about constructing their most balanced and effective drive of the game, a mix of three passes (for 25 yards) and five runs (for 30 yards) that pushed New Orleans to first-and-10 from the Tampa Bay 20-yard line with 1:19 left in the quarter.

But with the Saints in scoring position, and touchdowns scarce among the two combatants, New Orleans couldn't throw what undoubtedly would have amounted to an offensive haymaker.

Running back Mark Ingram II took the handoff off left guard, manipulated his way through heavy traffic and as he anticipated contact, covered the football with both hands.

It wasn't enough.

As safety Logan Ryan and linebacker Lavonte David converged for the tackle, Ryan attacked the ball and executed a perfect punch-out at the 11-yard line. When linebacker Carl Nassib recovered at the 10, New Orleans went from the possibility of a lead-taking field goal and, perhaps, backbreaking touchdown, to an empty red zone trip and a score that remained 3-3.

With 71 seconds remaining in the third quarter, there remained sufficient time and opportunity for the Saints to rebound from the turnover and win the game. But the lost fumble was a heavy blow for the offense, which didn't again operate with that kind of rhythm and balance down the stretch.

## GAME SUMMARIES

**Week 3: Panthers 22, Saints 14; September 25, 2022 @ Bank of America Stadium** – The New Orleans Saints have identified their biggest enemy and unfortunately it hasn't been any of the three opponents they've faced so far in 2022.

In a 22-14 loss to Carolina at Bank of America Stadium in Charlotte, which dropped the Saints' record to 1-2 as they prepare for next week's game against Minnesota in London, New Orleans again did things that are difficult to overcome for teams in search of victory.

They don't have to be reminded of it. The examples were sprinkled through all three units against the Panthers. New Orleans failed to score until the fourth quarter. On New Orleans' second possession of the first quarter, Panthers OLB **Frankie Luvu** stripped the ball from Saints RB **Alvin Kamara** and it was picked up by DE **Marques Haynes Sr.** 44 yards for a touchdown.

New Orleans still struggled offensively through the second quarter, as they were forced to punt two more times, victimized by penalties on each possession. But after Panthers K **Eddy Piniero** made a 48-yard field goal, New Orleans moved the ball to the Panthers 11-yard line, where QB **Jameis Winston** connected with rookie WR **Chris Olave** on a 49-yard completion. However Panthers DE **Henry Anderson** blocked a 30-yard field goal attempt and the Panthers held a 13-0 halftime lead

New Orleans opened up the third quarter with a 14-play, drive where New Orleans advanced to the Carolina 30-yard line, but K **Wil Lutz** missed a 48-yard field goal attempt. The Saints would finally respond on a possession that spanned the third and fourth quarters as Winston led the team on a 10-play, 89-yard drive capped off by a five-yard **Mark Ingram II** touchdown run.

On the second play of Carolina's ensuing possession, QB **Baker Mayfield** connected with Panthers WR **Laviska Shenault Jr.** on a short pass that turned into a 67-yard touchdown that gave the Panthers a 19-7 edge with 12:06 left in the fourth quarter.

Offensive Line Coach **Doug Marrone** - Played for the Miami Dolphins in 1987 and the Saints in 1989.

Passing Game Coordinator/Quarterbacks Coach **Ronald Curry** - A seventh round draft pick (235th overall) of the Oakland Raiders in 2002 out of the University of North Carolina and played for Oakland from 2002-08, appearing in 76 games with 32 starts, registering 193 receptions for 2,347 yards with 13 TDs.

Defensive Assistant **Sterling Moore** - enjoyed a seven-year NFL career with the Saints (2016-17), Buccaneers (2015), Dallas Cowboys (2012-14) and New England Patriots (2011-12), starting 31-of-75 career games, while accumulating 185 tackles, six interceptions, 41 passes defended, eight forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries. In his first season in New Orleans in 2016, Moore appeared in 13 games with 12 starts and registered a career-best 55 tackles (47 solo), two interceptions, a team-leading and career-high 14 passes defended and a forced fumble.

Co-Defensive Coordinator/Secondary Coach **Kris Richard** - A third-round draft pick (85th overall) of the Seattle Seahawks in 2002, Richard played in 38 games at cornerback and on special teams with the Seahawks from 2002-04 before finishing his playing career with the San Francisco 49ers in 2005.

Asst. Offensive Line Coach **Zach Strief** - Originally entered the NFL as a seventh round draft pick of the Saints in 2006 and played for the team for 12 seasons, playing in 158 games with 93 starts, opening 87 contests at right tackle and serving as an offensive team captain five times.

Pass Rush Specialist **Brian Young** - Played in the NFL from 2000-08 with the St. Louis Rams his first four seasons, who originally selected him in the fifth round of the 2000 NFL Draft (139th overall) from Texas-El Paso and final five campaigns with the Saints, playing in 124 games, recording 22.5 career sacks and eight fumble recoveries.

Since 2006, the Saints have the best road record in the NFC, second-best in the NFL at 77-54 (.588). In 2021, New Orleans finished 6-3 on the road, winning a seventh away from the Caesars Superdome when the season opening win vs. Green Bay was relocated to Jacksonville due to Hurricane Ida. ### BUCKING THE ODDS

The Saints have a long tradition of finding players as free agents signed after the draft that make an impact. Several play key roles.

Wide Receiver/Return Specialist **Deonte Harty** finished ranked second on the team with 570 receiving yards on 36 catches (team-best 15.8 avg., seventh in the NFL), while leading the club in kickoff return average (23.8 avg.) and punt return average (9.5 avg.) in 2021.

Wide receiver **Marquez Callaway** led the team in 2021 in two of four major receiving categories with a club-best 46 receptions for a team-high 698 yards (15.2 avg., ranked tenth in the NFL) and a club-best six TD grabs as the

team's only offensive skill player to play in all 17 games. On Sunday at Carolina, Callaway had his first catch of 2022 at an opportune time, a four-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter.

Defensive end **Carl Granderson** played in 15 games in 2021 with three starts and posted 24 tackles and three sacks. In Sunday's loss at Carolina, he picked up his first takedown of 2022, splitting a sack with J.T. Gray.

Punter **Blake Gillikin** enjoyed an October where he was selected as NFC Special Teams Player of the Month. He finished his first season in 2021 with punting duties ranked third in the league with 29 punts dropped inside the 20-yard line. In Week One, he picked up where he left off with a 46.0 net punting average.

**Defensive back** J.T. Gray led the NFL with 19 special teams stops (league-best 16 solo) and this season was voted by his teammates as the club's special teams captain and was selected to the Pro Bowl as a starter and as a first-team *Associated Press* All Pro. In 2022, he leads the team with three coverage stops and recorded his first quarter quarterback takedown, splitting a sack with Granderson in Sunday's loss at Carolina.

Tight End **Juwan Johnson** led his position group with four touchdown receptions in 2021, converting to the position after playing in college and starting his Black and Gold career in 2020 as a wideout. In 2022, he leads his position group in receiving with six grabs for 83 yards.

Running Back **Tony Jones Jr.**, spent the entire 2021 campaign on the active roster after being elevated in Week 17 in 2020, rushing for 142 yards to provide depth to the running back position.

Offensive Lineman **Calvin Throckmorton** was one of two Saints linemen to play in all 17 games in his second season in 2021, starting four at right guard and the last nine contests at left guard. Throckmorton saw his first action on offense on Sunday at Carolina, playing at left guard in the second half.

Defensive Tackle **Shy Tuttle** joined the club in 2019 as an undrafted free agent and has played in 46 regular season games with 19 starts, posting 52 tackles, two sacks, one interception, seven passes defended, one forced fumble and one recovery for one of the league's top run defenses. In 2021, Tuttle played in all 17 games with 15 starts and finished with a career-high 48 tackles, three passes defended, one forced fumble and a fumble recovery in the season finale at Atlanta. In 2022, through the first three games, Tuttle leads the defensive line with 18 tackles, a split sack and one pass defense.

### PRACTICE MAKES PERFECT

A spot on the practice squad is another avenue to eventually get onto the active roster and have the opportunity to contribute. Below is an overview of players on the club's roster with extensive practice squad experience.

Running back **Dwayne Washington** participated on the Saints practice squad briefly in 2018 after spending most of the 2016 and 2017 seasons on Detroit's active roster. Through development, the tailback, in addition to his running skills, has developed into a core special teams player with 11 stops, to have a career-high seven for 2021.

Tight end **Juwan Johnson** was signed by New Orleans out of Oregon, where he spent his graduate transfer season following the 2020 NFL Draft as a wideout. Recording four receptions for 39 yards seven contests, Johnson spent the majority of the season on the practice squad. Converted to tight end in 2021 and leading the position group with four touchdowns, Johnson's took advantage of his frame and participation in his first full offseason strength and conditioning program in 2022 and leads the tight ends group with eight receptions for 63 yards.

After spending the last six weeks of the 2019 season and the first 16 weeks of the 2020 campaign on the team's practice squad, linebacker **Andrew Dowell** was elevated to the club's active roster for the regular season finale at Carolina. In two preseason games in 2021, he posted five tackles, one forced fumbles and two coverage spots to secure a regular season roster spot. In Week 3 at New England, Dowell recorded the first blocked punt that an opponent had against the Patriots since the 2015 season. Dowell's five special teams tackles on December 19 at Tampa Bay was the highest single-game total in the NFL in 2021 and he finished the season tied for fifth in the league with 14 coverage stops.

After splitting his rookie season in 2018 between the practice squad and active roster, defensive back **J.T. Gray** enjoyed a breakthrough campaign in 2019, when he was selected *Associated Press* second-team All-Pro when he recorded 16 special teams tackles, one blocked punt and one coverage fumble recovery. In 2021, he was selected as a first-team All-Pro and to his first career Pro Bowl (starter), when he led the NFL with 19 special teams tackles (league-leading 16 solo). Gray leads the team with three special special teams stops in 2022.

After spending the bulk of his rookie season on the Saints practice squad, fullback **Adam Prentice** joined the 53-man roster on November 25, 2021 and contributed on offense and special teams for New Orleans in the last seven contests with three starts. New Orleans logged at least 150 yards rushing in three of the team's final seven contests, including a season-high 193 in the season finale at Atlanta.

Originally signing as an undrafted free agent with Kansas City in 2014 out of BYU, safety **Daniel Sorensen** spent the first half of his rookie season on the Chiefs practice squad before being elevated to the active roster at midseason where he contributed with seven tackles. Sorensen has played in 112 games with 41 starts, posting 378 tackles, 4.5 sacks, 12 interceptions, four returned for touchdowns, 33 passes defended, four forced fumbles, three fumble recoveries, 31 coverage stops, one special teams fumble recovery and one blocked field goal. On Sunday at Carolina, Sorensen led the Saints with two special teams tackles, his first two with New Orleans.

A converted quarterback from college who ended up playing both safety and linebacker at Utah, **Chase Hansen** was originally signed by New Orleans as a free agent after the 2019 NFL Draft. After splitting the bulk of the 2021 season between the practice squad and the active roster where he recorded one special teams tackle in three games, Hansen recorded one coverage stop in the 2022 season-opening win at Atlanta on September 11.

Ahead is a synopsis of several returning players and newcomers through the draft and free agency to the 2022 Saints offensive line:

**Tackle/Guard James Hurst** - An eight-year NFL veteran who was signed as a free agent from Baltimore in 2020, Hurst has 122 career regular season appearances with 67 starts at three different positions on the inside and outside. His versatility came in handy in 2020, as he started two contests at left tackle and one at left guard and the Saints gained over 200 yards rushing each time. In 2021, Hurst moved into the lineup for eight games at left tackle in place of an injured Armstead, two at left guard in place of an injured Andrus Peat and three at right tackle for an injured Ryan Ramczyk, starting contests at three different positions. Hurst has started the first three games at left tackle.

**Right Tackle Ryan Ramczyk** - The Black and Gold used their second first round selection in the 2017 NFL Draft to snag Ramczyk out of Wisconsin, one of the best linemen in the entire draft. After opening all 16 games and both post-season contests in 2017 and being selected as a PFWA All-Rookie, he has been selected as an AP All-Pro selection three times since

**Center/Guard Erik McCoy** - New Orleans traded up in the second round of the 2019 NFL Draft to select this standout from Texas A&M, who was a three-year starter, anchoring the middle of the Aggies line. In 2018, he was a team captain who paved the way for the SEC's leading rusher and in 2019 was the first Saint in franchise history to start at center in Week One, opening all 16 regular season contests. McCoy opened all 16 contests and both postseason games in 2020 for the NFL's sixth-ranked rushing offense. McCoy started 13 contests at center in 2021. Prior to the Week One season opener at Atlanta, McCoy agreed to a five-year contract extension with the Saints.

**Guard/Center Cesar Ruiz** - The hard-working, talented and intelligent lineman is a perfect fit for New Orleans' culture with the 24th pick in the 2020 NFL Draft out of Michigan. The three-year letterman played in 36 games in college, starting his last 31 including the final 26 at center, earning All-Big Ten in 2019. Ruiz settled in at right guard in the last 15 games, with nine starts, as well as both post-season contests. When McCoy suffered a lower leg injury in the first quarter of the 2021 season-opening win over Green Bay, Ruiz transitioned over to his natural position, where the Saints did not give up a sack and started four contests in the middle. He returned to right guard on Oct. 25 at Seattle and was the only lineman in 2021 to not miss a start. The 34 consecutive starts along the offensive line for Ruiz is the longest current streak for a Saint.

**Tackle/Guard Andrus Peat** - A first round selection (13th overall) in the 2015 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Peat was considered one of the top college linemen in 2014. In his first seven seasons, he's played in 86 regular season games with 81 starts, opening a contest at every position except center. In 2020, he opened 13 contests at left guard as he was part of the NFC Pro squad for the third consecutive season. In 2021, he opened the first six contests, where New Orleans got off to a 4-2 start before suffering a season-ending pectoral injury. In his return to the starting lineup in the 2022 season opener in Atlanta, New Orleans rushed for 151 yards.

**Tackle Landon Young** - A mainstay at left tackle for his entire college career at Kentucky, Young played in 49 contests with 30 starts in his college career. The Lexington, Ky. native was selected by New Orleans in the sixth round of the 2021 NFL Draft and held up to the competition in training camp to snare a roster spot. Young opened one contest at right tackle in 2021 and serves as Ramsey's backup on the right side.

**Offensive Lineman Calvin Throckmorton** - This 6-5, 309 pound former four-year starter on the Oregon line was signed as an undrafted free agent in 2020, possessing the flexibility to play all five positions along the offensive line. After spending his rookie season on the practice squad, Throckmorton increased strength in the 2021 offseason and made strides in training camp, securing a roster spot. In his NFL debut in the 2021 season opening-win, Throckmorton was called to play right guard following a lower leg injury to McCoy in the first quarter, subsequently starting four contests. He then moved into left guard, Oct. 25 at Seattle following a shoulder injury to Andrus Peat and opened the last ten. On Sunday at Carolina, Throckmorton played the entire second half at left guard after Peat suffered a concussion.

With nine picks in 2015, the Saints picked six defensive players, the most taken since New Orleans chose nine in a 12-round selection meeting in 1990. Below is an overview of the defensive players selected by New Orleans from 2015-22 currently with the club:

**Cornerback Paulson Adebo, Stanford (D3-21)** - Selected in the third round (76th overall) of the 2021 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Adebo finished his college career playing in 22 games with 21 starts and recording 97 tackles, 34 passes defended and eight interceptions, earning All-Pac-12 in 2018 and 2019. He started in the opener and became the first Saint to record an interception in his NFL debut since 2002. With three picks on the season, he became only the fifth Saints rookie to reach that level. Overall, he posted 63 tackles (54 solo), three picks and eight passes defended. After missing the first two contests of 2022 with an ankle injury, Adebo made his regular season debut on Sunday at Carolina, making an impact as the Saints allowed only 148 net yards passing.

**Linebacker Zack Baun, Wisconsin (D3a-20)** - Selected in the third round (74th overall) of the 2020 NFL Draft out of the Wisconsin, Baun finished his college career with 154 tackles, 15 sacks, two interceptions, one returned for a TD, six passes defended, three forced fumbles and a recovery. The Saints were attracted to his playmaking ability Baun finished with eight coverage stops in 2021, adding 22 defensive stops (16 solo) and a return of a blocked field goal. In 2022, he has recorded two coverage stops to tie for the team lead.

**Defensive End Marcus Davenport, Texas-San Antonio (D1-18)** - Davenport joined the Saints with the 14th overall pick in the 2018 NFL Draft after showing potential and production as a pass rusher at Texas-San Antonio. In four seasons, Davenport posted 22 sacks, including 8.5 in 2017 when he captured Conference USA Defensive Player of the Year. Davenport's strength on the line is a valuable asset for the Saints front, posting six sacks in 13 games in 2019. Davenport finished second on the team with a career-high nine sacks and added a club-best three forced fumbles and a fumble recovery in 11 games with nine starts in 2021, despite missing six games.

**Linebacker Kaden Elliss, Idaho (D7-19)** - New Orleans selected this four-year starter from Idaho to compete at both linebacker and contribute on special teams. The Salt Lake City native finished his college career with 288 stops 47 tackles for loss and 17 sacks. After missing the bulk of his rookie year with a knee injury, Elliss showed promise with five stops on coverage units in 2020 and in 2021, his progress continued with 13 stops, one sack, one fumble recovery and one special teams tackle.

**Cornerback Marshon Lattimore, Ohio State (D1a-17)** - The 11th overall selection in the 2017 NFL draft out of Ohio State and the first corner taken possesses all the traits of a lockdown defender. With his agile, fluid style, Lattimore has the ability to shut down the best wide receivers. In 2017, he finished with 53 stops, five picks, to lead NFL rookies and the Saints, tying a team rookie record, a club-best 18 passes defended, a forced fumble and a recovery. Lattimore was the first Saints corner selected to the Pro Bowl since 1995 and selected as AP Defensive Rookie of the Year. His five takeaways in 2018 led the team, adding two more picks in the NFC Divisional Playoff win. In 2021, he was named the Week Six NFC Defensive Player of the Week, recording a career-high six passes defenses at Washington, the league's highest total since 2017, reaching the Pro Bowl for the fourth time. He finished with 68 tackles (53 solo), three picks, a career-high and league-best 19 passes defended and a fumble recovery to lead the team with four takeaways.

**Defensive Tackle David Onyemata, Manitoba (D4-16)** - Possessing a unique combination of size and speed, this Nigeria native had an impressive rookie year after becoming the first player from the University of Manitoba to be drafted into the NFL. Despite being new to football, the 2016 fourth round draft pick became a critical member on the interior of the Saints defensive front in 2017, playing in all 16 games with six starts, making 40 tackles and two sacks. Overall in his career, he has played in 90 contests

with 52 starts, posting 221 stops, 18 sacks, one interception, five passes defended, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery. In 2021, Onyemata started all 11 games he played in and posted 34 tackles, two sacks for a loss of 17 yards and one one fumble recovery.

**Defensive End Payton Turner, Houston (D1-21)** - Selected 28th overall in the first round of the 2021 NFL Draft, the Texas native comes off a senior campaign where he posted 10.5 tackles for loss and five sacks in only five contests. During his four collegiate seasons, Turner notched career totals of 115 tackles (68 solo), ten sacks, 25 tackles for loss, one interception, one forced fumble, ten passes defended and one blocked punt. After having his rookie campaign cut short by a shoulder injury, Turner came back strong in the 2022 season opener at Atlanta with his blocked field goal on the last play of the game securing a dramatic come-from behind 27-26 victory for New Orleans.

**Linebacker Pete Werner, Ohio State (D2-21)** - New Orleans selected this three-year starter from Ohio State to compete at the linebacker position. The Indianapolis, Ind. native finished his college career playing in 47 career games with 35 starts, recording 185 tackles (111 solo), 16 stops for loss, four sacks, 11 passes defended, four forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Werner helped power the Buckeyes to the College Football Playoff championship game as a senior in 2020, when he was voted by Big Ten coaches as a first-team All-Conference selection and a Butkus Award semifinalist, posting 54 tackles, 2.5 stops for loss, one sack and two forced fumbles. Werner made his first career start in Week Three and on Oct. 3 vs. the New York Giants had ten tackles. Leading the team with 13 stops in Week 6 at the Washington Football Team, Werner became the first Saints rookie since 2015 to have back-to-back performances of double-digit stops. He finished his rookie campaign with 59 defensive tackles (33 solo) and three special teams stops on the season. In 2022, Werner, currently leads the New Orleans defense with 31 stops, a forced fumble, a pass defense and a coverage tackle.

**Defensive Back P.J. Williams, Florida State (D3b-15)** - Williams' career was initially limited by missing all but two games his first two seasons, but he's rebounded to miss only four contests with injury since. An experienced starter from Florida State, who developed into one of the nation's top cover corners, in 2019, he made 41 stops, a sack, an interception and three passes defended, serving as the team's nickel corner. In the Dec. 22, 2019 win at Tennessee, Williams further showed his versatility by making the switch to safety after Marcus Williams was forced to depart with a groin injury and then starting in Williams' place in the regular season finale at Carolina. Williams finished tied for the team lead with three picks in 2021 and added 42 tackles (36 solo), two sacks, four passes defended and one forced fumble, playing in 16 games with four starts. In 2022, Williams will play multiple positions in the secondary.

In rush defense, the Saints gave up only 80.2 net yards per game in 2018. The 2019 Saints finished fourth in the NFL in opponent rushing yards per game (91.3). 2018-19 marked only the second time they did so in back-to-back seasons in franchise history, joining the 1986-1987 teams. The 2020 Saints were fourth in the NFL in opponent rushing yards per game and opponent rushing yards per carry.

The Saints continued to effectively stop the run in 2021. New Orleans ranked fourth in opponent rushing yards per game (93.5) and first in opponent yards per rush (3.7).

The Saints have stopped the run impressively the past four seasons. In seven straight games in 2018, they didn't surrender 100 rushing yards to an opponent for the first time since 2007 had a seven-game run in 2020. In 2021, the Saints didn't give up 100 yards rushing in their last four contests. Below are the longest streaks in team history the defense has gone without surrendering 100 yards. Between 2017-20 they didn't allow a 100-yard rusher in a 55 straight games (regular season/postseason), the longest streak in NFL history. In holding Buccaneers TB Ronald Jones to nine yards on Nov. 8, New Orleans' efforts produced dominant results as his rushing total was the lowest for a leading rusher for an opponent during the streak. Keeping San Francisco RB Jerick McKinnon to 18 carries for 33 yards (1.8 avg.), New Orleans set the NFL record for the longest streak of keeping individual rushers under 100. After the last streak ended, New Orleans again had the longest current NFL streak of not surrendering a 100-yard rusher until the 2022 opener when 120 rushing yards were given up to Atlanta RB Cordarelle Patterson. New Orleans got back to their run-stopping ways in Week Two vs. Tampa Bay, when they gave up only 72 yards rushing on 30 carries (2.4 avg.) with zero touchdowns.

## SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

**Deonte Harty** has made an impact on New Orleans' return game since being picked up an undrafted free agent in 2019. Harris was signed following the NFL Draft out of NCAA Division II Assumption, where he finished his college career as one of the most prolific returners in NCAA history. In the final game of his college career, he set the NCAA-All Division record for career combined return TDs (14).

In 2019, Harty brought back 36 punts for 338 yards (9.4 avg.), ranked first in the NFC and fourth in the National Football in punt return average, ranked second among rookies, following a 53-yard runback for a touchdown in the first quarter of the Sept. 22 33-27 win at Seattle.

He also returned 24 kickoffs for 644 yards (26.8 avg.), second in the NFC and third in the NFL and has recorded one special teams stop. On offense Harty carried twice for 18 yards (9.0 avg.) and caught six passes for 24 yards.

Harris is the first player signed by New Orleans as an undrafted rookie following the draft to be selected to the Pro Bowl as a rookie.

Overall, Harty 25.8 kickoff return average ranked fourth in Saints club record books, while his 9.9 punt return average ranks sixth. He's added 64 receptions for 793 yards (12.4 avg.) with four TDs to serve as an offensive threat.

**Blake Gillikin** was signed by New Orleans following the 2020 NFL Draft after a college career at Penn State, where he finished tied for second on the Nittany Lions' career

gross punting average charts (43.03). After spending his rookie season on Injured Reserve, Gillikin had a 42.0 net punting average, eighth in the league and 29 inside-the-20 yard line, third in the NFL and tying the single-season club record. Gillikin enjoyed a breakout performance in Week 5, where he had three punts drop inside-the-three-yard line at Washington, flipping the field position battle and becoming the first punter since at least 2000 to have three punts of 53-plus yards downed inside the three-yard line. In the Oct. 31 win over Tampa Bay, Gillikin punted at a 48.0 net clip and had a career-best 63-yard punt, helping him earn October's NFC Special Teams Player of the Month.

### COVERAGE UNITS

New Orleans' coverage and block units in 2022 will be led by linebackers **Zack Baun**, **Andrew Dowell** and **Kaden Elliss**, defensive back **J.T. Gray**, fullback **Adam Prntice**, safety **Daniel Sorensen** and running back **Dwayne Washington**.

One of the club's two third round draft picks in 2020, Baun, a former Wisconsin standout, embraced work on the club's coverage units in 2020 with three stops. On Sept. 19 at Carolina, he made an adept play by returning a blocked field goal and was ranked fourth on the team with eight stops. After posting eight stops in 2021, Baun is tied for the team lead with three coverage tackles in 2022.

After spending the bulk of the 2019 and 2020 season on the Saints practice squad, Dowell recorded his first career blocked punt on September 26 at New England. He ranked second on the team with 14 stops and was tied for fifth in the NFL after having a career-high five tackles (four solo) on December 19 at Tampa Bay, the highest single-game total in the National Football League in 2021.

A seventh round draft pick of New Orleans in 2019, Elliss' blue collar mentality fit in with the coverage units with four stops in both 2020 and 2021, picking up his first special teams tackle of 2022 on Sunday at Carolina.

Sorensen's a ninth-year NFL veteran who signed with New Orleans as an unrestricted free agent from Kansas City, where he spent the first eight seasons of his career, posting 29 coverage stops, one special teams fumble recovery and one blocked field goal to go with 378 defensive tackles, 4.5 sacks, 12 interceptions, 33 passes defended, four forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries. Sorensen picked up the first two coverage tackles of his Saints career on Sunday at Carolina.

Signed by the Saints after the 2018 NFL Draft out of Mississippi State, Gray enjoyed a banner campaign in 2021, emerging as one of the league's elite players on special teams. Voted by his teammates as the club's special teams captain for the first time, Gray led the NFL with 19 tackles in 16 games and added three defensive stops as he was selected as a Pro Bowl starter and as the team's only first-team *Associated Press* All-Pro. Playing in 54 career games, Gray has career totals of 47 special teams stops, one blocked punt, three fumble recoveries and seven defensive tackles, a split sack and one pass defended, being tied for the team lead in coverage stops (three).

A national champion wrestler in high school as well as a two-time California state champion, Prentice brings physicality to two of the most physical areas of football. Contributing on both coverage units and the run/pass game with his blocking and pass-catching abilities, this former Fresno State and South Carolina standout recorded one stop in limited action in 2021 and had his first tackle of 2022 on Sept. 18 vs. Tampa Bay.

Originally a seventh round draft pick of the Detroit Lions in 2016, since being promoted to the Saints active roster from the practice squad at the start of the 2018 season, the former University of Washington standout has become a core special teamer for New Orleans. Washington has recorded 15 stops, deflected a punt and recovered a blocked punt, posting a career-best seven stops in 2021. Pressed into tailback duty on Sept. 18 vs. Tampa Bay as well, Washington responded with four carries for 18 yards, including a key third down conversion in the third quarter.

## QUARTERBACKS

### JAMEIS WINSTON

- Winston signed with New Orleans after the 2020 NFL Draft after starting all 16 games for Tampa Bay in 2019, completing 380-of-626 passes (60.7%) for 5,109 yards with 33 touchdowns and an 84.3 passer rating, also carrying 59 times for 250 yards with a touchdown. Winston's NFL-high passing yardage total was the eighth-highest total in NFL record books as he became only the eighth passer to reach 5,000 yards in a season. In Week 14 and 15 wins, Winston tossed for 456 and 458 yards, becoming the only player in NFL history to pass for 450 yards in consecutive contests.

- Overall, the Bessemer, Ala. Native has appeared in 86 regular season games with 80 starts, completing 1,738-of-2,835 passes (61.3%) for 21,840 yards with 139 touchdowns, 96 interceptions and an 87.7 passer rating, while adding 1,220 rushing yards and 11 touchdowns. After seeing limited action in 2020, Winston secured the starting spot in the 2021 preseason. Before suffering a season-ending knee injury in Week Eight, Winston completed 95-of-161 passes for 1,170 yards, 14 touchdowns, three interceptions and a 102.8 passer rating, ranked first in the NFL at the time of his injury in touchdown percentage (8.7).



• Through the first three contests of the 2022 season, Winston has completed 73-of-115 passes for 858 yards with four touchdowns, five interceptions and a 79.5 passer rating after his 353 passing yard total on Sunday at Carolina was his highest as a Saint.

## POWERFUL STARTS

• Winston improved his record in season-opening starts to 4-2 and became only the third Saints quarterback to win his first two season-opening starts as a member of the Black and Gold. Returning to the lineup after an extensive rehabilitation process, Winston completed 21-of-30 passes for 269 yards and two touchdowns for 213 yards, two touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 111.0 passer rating in the 27-26 win over Atlanta on Sept. 11.

• In the 2021 opener vs. Green Bay played in Jacksonville, Fla., Winston had one of the most impressive first starts in a Black and Gold uniform amongst its signal-callers. He passed for 148 yards on 14-of-20 passing (70.0%) with a 130.8 rating. Winston threw five touchdown passes. His five touchdown passes tied a career-high. He also finished with 37 rushing yards on six attempts. In his first start with the Saints, Winston became the third player since 1950 to throw for five touchdowns in his first start with a team. Winston's 148 passing yards is the fewest yards with five passing touchdowns since 1948. With zero interceptions, Winston became the first quarterback in NFL history to throw five touchdown passes with no interceptions in his first career start with a new team in an opener. Overall, Winston became the seventh quarterback with five touchdowns and no interceptions in an opener, and first since Baltimore QB Lamar Jackson did so at Miami on Sept. 8, 2019. Winston became the 33rd player to start a game at quarterback for New Orleans, and the 11th to win in his first start. The victory was Winston's first career win over Green Bay.

## COMEBACK KID

• In the Sept. 11 come-from-behind victory, Winston engineered the Saints from a 16-point fourth quarter deficit for the first time in franchise history. In leading two touchdown drives and the game-winning field goal drive, he completed 13-of-16 passes (81.3 percent) for 213 yards with two touchdowns and a perfect 158.3 passer rating in the final period of the contest. It was the 13th fourth quarter/overtime comeback of Winston's career.

## SECOND THROUGH FIVE

In his first five NFL seasons, Jameis Winston threw for 19,737 yards, the second-most yards ever by a player from their rookie season through their fifth season.

2 - Winston is only the second Heisman Trophy-winning quarterback to play for the Saints, joining Danny Wuerffel, the 1996 winner, who played for New Orleans from 1997-99. He also joins his current teammate Mark Ingram II (2009), running back Reggie Bush (2005), running back Ricky Williams (1998), running back George Rogers (1980) and running back Earl Campbell (1977) as winners of College Football's most prestigious award to suit up for the Black and Gold.

## BY THE NUMBERS

**12** - On October 3, 2021 vs. the New York Giants, Winston completed a career-best 12 consecutive passes for the second time in his career.

**72** - In the October 17, 2021 win over the Washington Football Team, Winston's 72-yard touchdown pass to WR/RS Deonte Harty was a career-long completion. Combined with the 49-yard hail mary touchdown pass at the end of the first half to WR Marquez Callaway, it marked the first time Winston had two touchdown passes of at least 45 yards in a contest.

### ANDY DALTON

- Dalton brings additional starting experience to the New Orleans Saints quarterback room. Originally a second round draft pick in the 2015 NFL Draft by the Cincinnati

Bengals out of TCU, Dalton has played in 152 career games with 148 starts for Cincinnati (2011-19), Dallas (2020) and Chicago (2021) and completed 3,122-of-5,018 passes (62.2 pct.) for 35,279 yards, 226 touchdowns, 135 interceptions and an 87.0 passer rating.

- In two preseason appearances, Dalton was flawless, completing ten-of-ten passes for 124 yards and a 151.7 passer rating and will serve as the backup to Winston.

## RUNNING BACKS

### ALVIN KAMARA

- A talented runner and receiver with a 5-10, 215-pound frame who was selected by the Saints in the third round of the 2017 NFL Draft out of the University of Tennessee, Kamara enjoyed an outstanding rookie campaign. He ranked first on the club and sixth in the NFL in yards from scrimmage (1,554), second on the team in rushing and receiving, carrying 120 times for 728 yards (6.1 avg.) with eight TDs and a two-point conversion, catching 81 passes for 826 yards (10.2 avg.) with five TDs and a kickoff return for a TD for a club rookie record 14 total scores, tied for second in the NFL. Kamara finished first in the NFL in yards per carry.

- Kamara was the first Saints offensive rookie selected to the Pro Bowl since Rueben Mayes (1986), as an *Associated Press* second team All-Pro (flex), the clubs' first rookie All-Pro since 1993. He was named *The Sporting News* NFL Rookie of the Year and *AP* NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year.

Since entering the National Football League in 2017, Kamara ranks second in the league in total yards from scrimmage (7,547).

• In 2020, Kamara even exceeded expectations as one of the NFL's most electric players in the NFL. He carried 187 times for a career-high 932 yards (5.0 avg.) with 16 touchdowns, tied for first in the NFL. He led running backs in receiving with a career-high and team best 83 receptions for 756 yards (9.1 avg.) with five TDs. Kamara, who was the second Saint to lead the team in rushing and receiving, led the NFL with a team-record 21 total touchdowns, was second with 93 first downs and third with a career-best 1,688 yards from scrimmage, the seventh-highest total in club history.

• Despite missing four games in the middle of the 2021 season with a knee injury, Kamara led the Saints in rushing and receiving, for the second consecutive season carrying 240 times for 898 yards and four TDs and catching 47 passes for 439 yards with five TDs for a club-best 1,337 yards from scrimmage, surpassing wide receiver Marques Colston (2009-12), running back Mark Ingram II (2014-17) and wide receiver Michael Thomas (2016-19) as the first Saint to have 1,000 total yards from scrimmage in his first five seasons and/or in five consecutive seasons. New Orleans posted a 9-4 record in the 13 games that Kamara appeared in.

## TOUCHDOWN LEADER

In the Saints' 2020 Christmas 52-33 win over the Vikings, Kamara tied the National Football League record for total touchdowns and rushing touchdowns, as he carried 22 times for a career-high 155 yards (7.0 avg.), adding three receptions for 17 yards for 172 yards from scrimmage. The rushing touchdowns record tied the record held by Ernie Nevers of the Chicago Cardinals since Nov. 28, 1929, while for total touchdowns, Kamara joins Nevers, Cleveland's Dub Jones (Nov. 25, 1951) and Chicago's Gayle Sayers (Dec. 12, 1965). The performance catapulted Kamara to the NFL's touchdown lead, as he joined running back Dalton Hilliard as only the second Saint to lead the league in touchdowns.

After Kamara's two-touchdown performance in the Week Five win over Washington, Kamara's 19 career games with at least two touchdowns are tied with four players for the third-most such games by a player in his first five seasons in NFL history. ## TRIUMPHANT RETURN

After being hobbled by ankle and hamstring injuries in 2020 that caused him to miss nine games and missing the entire 2021 campaign, Thomas returned in a big way in the team's 27-26 come-from-behind win at Atlanta to open the 2022 season on Sept. 11. After being held without a catch in the first half, Thomas came out and caught five passes for 57 yards with two fourth quarter touchdown grabs to power the team's comeback to a win for the first time in franchise history after being down by 16 points in the fourth quarter of a contest. On Sept. 18 vs. Tampa Bay, Thomas led the team in receiving with six grabs for 65 yards and a fourth quarter touchdown, to currently be tied for first in the NFL in scoring grabs. (three).

## JARVIS LANDRY

- Signed by New Orleans as a free agent after the 2022 NFL Draft, this former Litcher High School and LSU stand-out returns home as one of the league's most accomplished receivers has quickly established chemistry with Thomas and continuity with Jameis Winston and the Saints offense to become one of his top targets. Posting career totals in 126 career games with 114 Starts with the Miami Dolphins (2014-17), Cleveland Browns (2018-21) and Saints (2022), the five-time Pro Bowler has produced 701 catches for 7,759 yards with 37 touchdowns. He ranks fourth in the NFL in receptions since coming into the league as a second round pick of the Dolphins in 2014. Landry is just one of four players to have 695-plus catches since 2014. Since being drafted in 2014, Landry is ranked fourth in the league in receptions (701), eighth in first down receptions (399) and ninth in receiving yards (7,759).

## HOMECOMING

Landry made an immediate impact in the uniform of his home state team on Sept. 11 at Atlanta, grabbing a team-leading seven passes for a team-high 114 yards (club-best 16.3 yards per reception), with four of his catches going for first downs. Landry was particularly clutch on New Orleans' drive for the game-winning field goal late in the fourth quarter, when he made a difficult catch for a 40-yard gain, the longest reception of the game for the Saints. Landry and Thomas are currently tied for the team lead in receiving with 11 receptions apiece, while Landry leads the club in receiving yardage (139). In two previous appearances against this Sunday's opponent, Carolina as a member of the Dolphins (11/13/2017) and Browns (12/9/18), Landry has recorded eight grabs for 99 yards with two touchdowns, also rushing for a career-high 54 yards and having a career-long 51-yard rush in the 26-20 victory as a member of Cleveland



## TWO AT A TIME

Since Week 2 of his rookie season in 2014 until Week 2 of the 2021 campaign, Landry caught at least two passes in 111 consecutive games. His streak was the best in the NFL since 2014 and was the fourth-longest all-time.

## MARQUEZ CALLAWAY

•After a productive college career on offense and special teams at Tennessee, Callaway joined the Black and Gold as an undrafted free agent in 2020. Appearing in 11 games with three starts, Callaway posted 21 receptions for 213 yards and also made an impact as a gunner and punt returner. He returned 11 punts for 122 yards (11.1 avg.), four kickoff returns for 94 yards (23.5 avg.) and recovered two fumbles on special teams. In 2021, Callaway built an impressive sophomore campaign. As the only Saints skill position player to play in all 17 games, Callaway provided consistency to the position, recording 46 receptions for a club-best 698 yards with a team-high six touchdowns.

## Q FACTOR

In the Sept. 26, 2021 win at New England, Callaway had four receptions for 48 yards and scored his first career NFL touchdown from Jameis Winston.

Callaway then made a couple of big catches on Oct. 3, 2021 vs. the New York Giants, catching two receptions for 74 yards, including a 58-yard grab in the second half.

In the 2021 Week Five win at Washington, Callaway posted four receptions for 85 yards with a career-high two touchdowns, including a perfectly anticipated 49-yard "Hail Mary" scoring reception from Winston at the end of the first half.

Although Callaway had only three receptions for 32 yards in the Oct. 25 win at Seattle, he saved his best for last with a fourth quarter 13-yard reception that advanced New Orleans to the Seahawks six-yard line and set up a 33-yard field goal.

Callaway's two receptions for 37 yards came at a crucial time in the Nov. 14 contest at Tennessee, as he caught a grab for a 22-yard gain on the first play of New Orleans' final drive and then caught a 15-yard touchdown on third-and-13 on the drive to put the Saints within two.

Callaway caught a 26-yard touchdown on Nov. 21 at Philadelphia to give him a team-leading six scoring grabs.

On December 19 at Tampa Bay, Callaway posted six receptions for a career-high 112 yards, including grabs of 33 and 40 yards to help pace the passing offense.

In the Jan. 2, 2022 win over Carolina, Callaway helped spark the pass offense with a game-high six grabs for a game-high 97 yards, including crucial 28- and 15-yard receptions on a two minute drive at the end of the first half to set up a field goal as time expired at the end of the second quarter to close New Orleans' halftime deficit to one.

On Sept. 25 at Carolina, Callaway had an athletic one-handed four-yard touchdown catch in the fourth quarter.

## TRE'QUAN SMITH

• A talented fifth-year wideout, who was selected by New Orleans in the third round of the 2018 draft out of Central Florida, the 6-1, 210-pounder emerged as one of the Knights' top weapons from 2015-17 and was a key figure in their emergence. During that period, he caught 168 passes for 2,748 yards (16.4 avg.) with 22 touchdowns. In his final campaign for the 13-0 Knights in 2017, Smith appeared in and started all 13 games and hauled in 54 receptions for 1,082 yards (19.9 avg.) and 13 touchdowns.

• Smith recorded five touchdowns apiece in each of his first two seasons and achieved more consistency in 2020, when he posted a career-high 34 receptions for 448 yards (13.2 avg.) with four touchdowns to rank fourth on the Black and Gold in receiving. He was activated off Injured Reserve for the NFC Divisional Playoff vs. Tampa Bay, where he recorded three receptions for 85 yards (28.3 avg.) with two touchdowns.

• Activated off Injured Reserve on Oct. 25, 2021, Smith played in 11 of the last 12 games in the 2021 campaign and recorded 32 receptions for 377 yards with three touchdowns, finishing his season on a high note at Atlanta in the regular season finale, when he posted five grabs for 76 yards and a TD.

• Smith made his 2022 debut at Carolina Sunday and posted four receptions for 105 yards (26.3 avg.)

**CHRIS OLAVE**

- A talented wide receiver who became one of the most prolific receivers in Buckeyes history, Olave played in 47 games and caught 176 passes for 2,711 yards (15.4 avg.) with 35 touchdowns. Olave's 35 career touchdown receptions set an Ohio State program record and ranks fourth in Big Ten history. His 11 career 100-yard games also ranks second in school history. Olave entered the starting lineup in 2019 with immediate results. He helped lead the Buckeyes to three consecutive Big Ten championships (2018-2020) and back-to-back College Football Playoff appearances (2019, 2020). In the 2020 CFP Semifinal vs. Clemson, Olave had a career night, hauling in six passes for 132 yards and two touchdowns in a 49-28 win, securing a bid to play in the championship game. Olave will look to integrate into the Saints offense in training camp after a standout senior campaign, where he caught 65 passes for 936 yards (14.4 avg.) and 13 touchdowns, tied for sixth nationally, as he was selected as an AFCA first-team All-American and a consensus second-team All-American.

- Olave had an impressive debut in the Sept. 11 win at Atlanta, when he recorded three catches for 41 yards, as well as a successful two-point conversion and on Sunday at Tampa Bay, posted five receptions for a club-best 80 yards, including a 51-yard grab. After a nine-reception, 147-yard performance on Sunday at Carolina, Olave leads the team in receiving, receiving yardage and receiving average with 17 grabs for 268 yards (15.8 avg.) along with a successful two-point conversion. He leads all NFL rookies in receiving yards and yards per catch and is one grab behind his former Ohio State teammate Garrett Wilson for the rookie lead in receptions heading into Sunday's London matchup against Minnesota.

**TIGHT ENDS****ADAM TRAUTMAN**

- The Saints were pleased to find the 6-5, 253-pound Trautman available near the end of the third round of the 2020 NFL Draft and made an aggressive trade up to the 105th pick to add him out of Dayton. A converted high school quarterback, the Michigan native moved to tight end as a freshman developed into one of the top offensive player in NCAA FCS football, where he played in 44 games, recording 178 receptions for 2,295 yards (12.9 avg.) and 31 touchdowns. Though 16 contests in 2020, Trautman posted 15 receptions for 171 yards with one touchdown while also

impressively developing his blocking ability.

- In 2021, Trautman continued progress in both blocking and pass-catching, leading the tight end unit with 27 grabs for 263 yards and two touchdowns. Prior to being sidelined by a knee injury for three weeks, Trautman had recorded five catches in the team's Week 10 and 11 contests. Trautman will seek to pick up on this momentum in the 2022 offseason/preseason.

**TAYSOM HILL**

- Hill's brought unheralded versatility to the Saints offense and special teams. A constant participant on special teams from midseason in 2017 to midseason in 2020, as well as the backup signal-caller and as a runner and receiver, in 2018, Hill averaged 24.9 yards per return on 14 kickoff returns, had six coverage stops, second on the team, completed a ten-yard pass on a fake punt and blocked a punt. Overall, Hill carried 37 times for 196 yards (5.3 avg.), third on the team, with two touchdowns and completed three of seven passes for 64 yards. The blocked punt that sparked a division-clinching win at Tampa Bay, earning him Week 14 NFC Special Teams Player of the Week honors. In the postseason, he caught a touchdown, made a special teams tackle and executed a successful fake punt, making significant contributions in all facets as the team advanced to the NFC Championship game for the third time in franchise history.

- In 2019, Hill carried 27 times for 156 yards (5.8 avg.) with a touchdown, catching 19 passes for 234 yards with six TDs, deflecting a punt and posting two coverage stops. He ranked third on the club in touchdowns and third in receiving TDs. After a multi-threat performance Thanksgiving night at Atlanta, when he deflected a punt and caught and rushed for a touchdown. Hill became the first quarterback to rush for and catch a touchdown in the same contest since Jim McMahon (1983). In a valiant postseason effort vs. Minnesota, Hill led the team in rushing with four carries for 50 yards, caught two passes for 25 yards with a TD and completed a 50-yard pass.

- In 2020, Hill contributed on multiple facets, completing 88-of-121 passes (72.7%) for 928 yards with a 98.8 rating, rushing 87 times for 457 (5.3 avg.) yards with eight touchdowns, catching eight passes for 98 yards with a TD and playing on special teams units until Brees' rib injury. Following Brees' injury, November 15, Hill went 3-1 in four starts.

•In 12 games with nine starts in 2021, providing value at quarterback on offense and special teams, he completed 78-of-134 passes for 978 yards with four touchdowns, carried 70 times for 374 yards (5.3 avg.) with a club-best five touchdowns, caught four passes for 52 yards and added a special teams stop. In 2022, Hill will assist the Black and Gold offense in multiple facets. Making his debut in that role, he contributed on both offense and special teams in the season opener at Atlanta, Hill carried four times for a club-best 81 yards (20.3 avg.), including a career-long 57-yard carry, as well as an 11-yard rushing touchdown on the same first quarter drive of his long run. Hill also caught a pass for a two-yard gain and contributed on multiple special teams units both on the coverage and return teams.

## DEFENSIVE ENDS

### CAMERON JORDAN

•New Orleans' first choice in the 2011 NFL Draft (24th overall) out of the University of California, Jordan enjoyed another standout season in 2021, recording 59 tackles (38 solo), 12.5 sacks for a loss of 75.5 yards, tied for seventh in the NFL, including 8.5 takedowns in the last four contests to lead the league over that period, six passes defended and two forced fumbles. Jordan was selected to his seventh Pro Bowl, the most by a defensive player in club history and ranked second overall in team records. With 108 sacks since 2011, Jordan is ranked second on the Saints career sack list and ranked 25th on the National Football League's all-time quarterback takedown list. He's also proven to be one of the league's best run defenders, playing an important role in top five rush defenses in each of the past four seasons, headlining the only defense in the NFL to rank both in the top five in run defense and sacks over that period.

•The team's first round election in the 2018 NFL Draft out of Texas-San Antonio, In only eight games with six starts in 2021, Davenport has made an impact with his athleticism, strength and speed and finished ranked second on the Saints with a career-high nine sacks to go with a career-best 39 tackles, three forced fumbles and one fumble recovery.

## CARL GRANDERSON

•Signed by New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Wyoming in 2019, Granderson posted 17.5 career sacks in college and possesses the perfect body type for a pass rusher. As a rookie, Granderson appeared in eight regular season contests, posting ten tackles and one sack. In 2020, Granderson added 11 tackles, five sacks, ranked fourth on the team, a club-best two forced fumbles and one pass defended as he has seen more extensive time in the club's defensive line rotation as his game experience has continued to increase. On September 19, 2021 at Carolina, Granderson received his first start in place of an injured Marcus Davenport and blocked his first career field goal on special teams. In Week Five at the Washington Football Team, Granderson recorded his first takedown of 2021. He made his second on Thanksgiving night at Buffalo against his former Wyoming college teammate, Bills QB Josh Allen and had a key third quarter takedown on December 12 at the New York Jets against another high draft pick, New York signal-caller Zach Wilson.

## PAYTON TURNER

•With the 28th overall pick in the 2021 NFL Draft, the Saints added to the line with this gifted pass rusher. He appeared in five games in 2021 before spending the remainder of his rookie season on Injured Reserve (shoulder). Turner recorded 12 tackles (nine solo) and one sack while also appearing on special teams. A full recovery from the shoulder injury and hard work in the team's offseason program led to an impressive preseason for Turner. His work paid off in the season opener at Atlanta, when he blocked a 63-yard field goal attempt as time expired to secure the 27-26 win.

## DAVID ONYEMATA

- A fourth round selection out of Manitoba in 2016, Onyemata teams with Shy Tuttle to form a solid duo in the interior of the Saints defensive line. In 83 games with 45 starts in five seasons, he has posted 193 career tackles, 16.5 sacks, five passes defended, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery. In 2019, he opened all 15 regular season games he played in, posting 32 stops, one pass defended and three sacks for the NFL's fourth-ranked run defense. Onyemata was re-signed to a three-year contract by the Saints in the 2020 offseason and finished ranked third on the team with 6.5 quarterback takedowns, tied for sixth in the league among defensive tackles and one interception, starting every contest for a unit ranked fourth in the NFL in opponent net yards per game and fourth in run defense. In 2021, he anchored an interior that has helped the Saints defense currently ranked first in the league in opponent yards per rushing and fourth in opponent rushing yards per game.

## SHY TUTTLE

- Signed as an undrafted free agent out of the University of Tennessee in 1999, Tuttle contributed to a defensive unit in 2021 that ranked fourth in the NFL in run defense, seventh in total defense, and eighth in sacks. He played in all 17 games with 15 starts and posted 48 tackles (17 solo), three passes defended, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery. In four seasons in New Orleans, Tuttle has appeared in 48 regular season games, with 21 starts, recording 105 tackles (46 solo), 2.5 sacks, one interception, ten passes defended, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery. Tuttle enjoyed a standout performance against Tampa Bay on September 18, when he posted a team-high and career-high nine tackles, a split sack and a pass defended.

## KENTAVIUS STREET

- Signed with New Orleans at the start of the offseason, this fourth-year defensive lineman brings positional versatility to a formidable Saints defensive front. Originally a fourth round draft selection in the 2018 NFL Draft (128th overall) out of North Carolina State by San Francisco, Street enjoyed his most productive campaign in 2021. He appeared in all 17 regular season games with two starts, posting career-highs across the board; 27 tackles (15 solo), three sacks, six tackles for loss and one forced fumble, adding two more solo stops in three postseason contests as San Francisco advanced to the NFC Championship Game. Overall, the Greenville, N.C. native has appeared in 37 career regular season games with four starts for the 49ers and Saints, posting career totals of 47 tackles (27 solo), three sacks for a loss of 17 yards and one forced fumble.

# LINEBACKERS

## DEMARIO DAVIS

- This dependable and sure-tackling defender joined the New Orleans Saints in 2018 after spending his first six NFL seasons with the New York Jets and Cleveland Browns. For his career, the Brandon, Miss. Native has appeared in 163 career games with 149 starts for the Jets (2012-15, 2017), Cleveland (2016) and the Saints (2018-), recording 1,122 stops (745 solo), 30.5 sacks, two interceptions, 46 passes defended, three forced fumbles, seven fumble recoveries and 24 special teams tackles.

- In 2018, Davis opened all 16 contests and led the team with 110 stops (74 solo), five sacks to lead the linebackers, four passes defended, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. Davis' abilities to diagnose and tackle played a key role in New Orleans ranking second in the NFL in opponent rushing yards per game and opponent rushing yards per play. Participating in the postseason for the first time, Davis led the defense with 22 stops (15 solo), an interception in the NFC Championship and a pass defense. In 2019, he posted 111 stops, ranked first on the club, four sacks, one interception and 11 passes defended to help spur the league's fourth-ranked run defense.

- In 2020, Davis filled up the stat sheet with a team-leading 119 tackles (74 solo), four sacks and six passes defended. Davis became the first Saint to lead the team in tackles in three consecutive seasons since Jonathan Vilma (2008-10).

- In 2021 Davis led the team in tackles for the fourth consecutive season with 105 stops (70 solo), three sacks and seven passes defended. With 105 stops in 2021, Davis became the first Saint to reach the century mark in four consecutive seasons since S Roman Harper (2008-12) and joined Joe Federspiel as only the second Saints to exceed 100 stops in four consecutive seasons.

**ZACK BAUN**

• An athletic, sideline to sideline linebacker, possessing the rare combination of pass rush skills and the ability to drop in coverage. After a stellar career at Wisconsin, Baun played in 15 games in 2020, with three starts at strongside

linebacker, posting eight tackles (three solo) and four special teams stops. Overall in his college career, he played in 39 games with 27 starts, all which took place in his final two seasons, recording 154 tackles, 30.5 stops for loss, 15 sacks, two interceptions and three forced fumbles.

• Baun's strength and knowledge of the defense, which was on display when he led the team with five solo tackles in the season opening win vs. Green Bay.

• With Kwon Alexander missing the Week 16 contest vs. Miami due to COVID-19 protocols, Baun stepped into his place at weakside and tied a career-high with seven tackles (career-high tying five solo) and added one solo stop.

**KADEN ELLISS**

• Elliss was selected by the Saints with their second of two seventh round draft choices (244th overall) in 2019 out of Idaho. Elliss is a strong, athletic player with coverage, pass rush and run-stopping abilities who bounced back after missing the majority of 2019 (knee). In 2020, he appeared in 15 regular season games and two postseason contests on special teams recording five stops. The son of former NFL standout Luther Elliss, has utilized his strength, speed and size on defense and special teams. Elliss finished his third campaign with 13 stops, four special teams stops, one sack and one fumble recovery in 13 games.

**PETE WERNER**

• New Orleans selected this three-year starter from Ohio State in the second round of the 2021 NFL Draft. The Indianapolis native finished his college career playing in 47 career games with 35 starts, recording 185 tackles (111 solo), 16 stops for loss, four sacks, 11 passes defended, four forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Werner helped power the Buckeyes to the College Football Playoff championship game as a senior in 2020, when he was voted by Big Ten coaches as a first-team All-Conference selection and a Butkus Award semifinalist, posting 54 tackles, 2.5 stops for loss, one sack and two forced fumbles. Werner made his second career start Oct. 3 vs. the Giants and recorded a ten tackles. With 13 stops in Week Five at Washington, he became the first Saints rookie defender to reach double-digit totals in back-to-back games. He ranked fifth on the team with 59 tackles.

• Werner is enjoying a standout start to the 2022 season, starting all three games at weakside linebacker and ranking first on the team and tied for fifth in the National Football League with 31 tackles (23 solo), one stop for loss, one pass defense, one forced fumble and one special teams tackle, playing effective against both the run and the pass, even in coverage, where the team is currently ranked fifth in opponent passing yards per game.



## SECONDARY

### S TYRANN MATHIEU

• This versatile, hard-hitting, playmaking safety and New Orleans native returned home, signing after the 2022 NFL Draft and will bring extensive experience to the Saints secondary. Mathieu was originally selected by the Arizona Cardinals in the third round (69th overall) in the 2013 NFL Draft out of LSU and has played for the Cardinals (2013-17), Houston Texans (2018) and Kansas City Chiefs (2019-21). In nine NFL seasons, he has played in 132 regular season games with 121 starts and has posted career totals of 619 tackles (529 solo), 41 stops for loss, ten sacks for a loss of 78 yards, 26 interceptions for 335 returns yards, three brought back for touchdowns, 82 passes defended, four forced fumbles, seven fumble recoveries and five special teams stops. Mathieu has been selected to three Pro Bowls, three *Associated Press* All-Pro teams and the Pro Football Hall of Fame's 2010's All-Decade Team.

## NOSE FOR THE BALL

Saints safety Tyrann Mathieu comes to New Orleans after starting all 16 games he played in for Kansas City in 2021 and recording 76 tackles, one sack, a career-high three fumble recoveries, one sack and two interceptions to earn his second consecutive Pro Bowl selection. With the two picks in 2021, Mathieu's interception total since he entered the NFL in 2013 is tied for fifth over that span.

### CB MARSHON LATTIMORE

• Selected by the New Orleans Saints in the first round (11<sup>th</sup> overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft, Lattimore started all 13 games he appeared in. He totaled 53 tackles (44 solo), a

forced fumble, one fumble recovery, five interceptions for 85 yards and 18 passes defended, as he became the youngest Saint (21 years old) ever selected to the Pro Bowl and was selected as the *AP* NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year.

• In 2018, Lattimore opened all 16 contests and posted a career-high 59 tackles (49 solo), two interceptions, 12 passes defended, a club-best four forced fumbles, tied for fourth in the NFL and three fumble recoveries, returned for 91 yards, leading the team in takeaways and tied for the NFL lead in defensive fumble recoveries, the highest total among defensive backs. Lattimore also added two picks in the NFC Divisional Playoff win over Philadelphia.

• A standout 2019 campaign by Lattimore resulted in him being voted to the Pro Bowl, the only Saints cornerback to ever be selected multiple times. Lattimore started all 14 games he played in and posted 57 stops, one interception and ranked first on the team with 14 passes defended.

• In 2020, he posted a career-high 62 tackles (52 solo), two interceptions and 11 passes defended as he was voted to the Pro Bowl for the third time. High expectations follow in 2021 as he signed a long-term contract extension to lock up the lockdown corner in the New Orleans secondary.

• After signing a contract extension at the start of the season, Lattimore posted 68 stops, three picks, a career-high 19 passes defended, ranked third in the NFL and one fumble recovery, being selected to his fourth Pro Bowl.

## 2021 HIGHLIGHTS

Below were Lattimore's 2021 defensive highlights:

• In the September 26 28-13 win at New England, Lattimore picked off Patriots QB Mac Jones in the game's next to last play to seal the victory.

• In the Week Five win over Washington, Lattimore earned NFC Defensive Player of the Week honors, as he recorded a career-high six passes defended, the first time that occurred in the NFL since 2017 and tied for the second-highest total in the league since the 1992 season.

• In Week 13 vs. Dallas, Lattimore, posted eight tackles (five solo), a fourth quarter interceptions and a game-high three passes defended.

• In the Week 14 win at the New York Jets, Lattimore, recorded a game-high two passes defended and five tackles, as New York's longest reception in the contest went for only 27 yards.

## 2021 HIGHLIGHTS

• In the Week 15 9-0 win at Tampa Bay posted four solo tackles, two passes defended and his first fumble recovery of the season.

• After being selected to the Pro Bowl five days earlier, Lattimore posted a team-lead tying third interception in the third quarter vs. Miami on December 27.

### S MARCUS MAYE

• Marcus Maye joined the Saints as an unrestricted free agent in 2022, looking to solidify the safety position alongside Mathieu. Maye, entering his sixth NFL season, first entered the league as a second round draft pick (39th overall) of the New York Jets out of the University of Florida in 2017. He has started all 62 contests he has appeared in for

the Jets and Saints, posting career totals of 321 tackles (227 solo), 3.5 sacks for a loss of 19 yards, six interception returns for 148 yards, 24 passes defended, five forced fumbles, one fumble recovery and four special teams stops.

### CB PAULSON ADEBO

• New Orleans' third round selection (76th overall) in the 2021 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Adebo overcame not playing college football in 2020 to make significant contributions to the Saints secondary in his first season with the club.

The Texas native finished his college career playing in 22 games with 21 starts for Stanford and recording 97 tackles, 34 passes defended and eight interceptions, earning All-Pac 12 honors in both 2018 and 2019.

• Adebo showed his development by opening opposite Lattimore in the 2021 regular season opening win vs. Green Bay and returning a pick 33 yards in the third quarter to become the first Saints defender to have an interception in his NFL debut since LB James Allen vs. Tampa Bay on September 8, 2002. He then added a second pick in the Week Five win at Washington. With a pick in the regular season finale at Atlanta, Adebo finished his rookie campaign ranked fifth on the club with 63 tackles (54 solo), tied for first with three picks and added eight passes defended and two special teams stops.

### P.J. WILLIAMS

• A third round pick of the Saints in 2015 out of Florida State, Williams has appeared in 81 regular season games with 32 starts for New Orleans, posting 225 tackles, four sacks, eight interception returns for 168 yards with two touchdowns, 51 passes defended, three forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. In 2021, playing a hybrid role of both cornerback and safety, Williams tied for the team lead with three picks for 86 yards returned including a game-clinching 40-yard interception return for a touchdown on October 31 vs. Tampa Bay, while playing outside cornerback, nickel cornerback, strong safety or free safety.

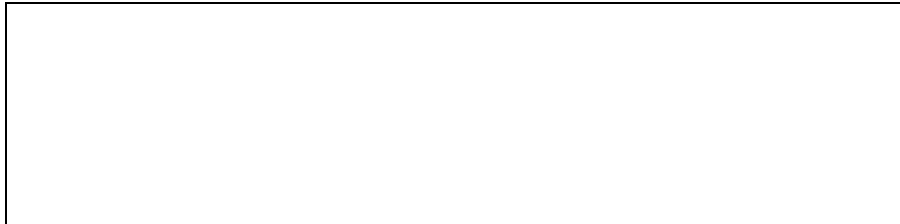

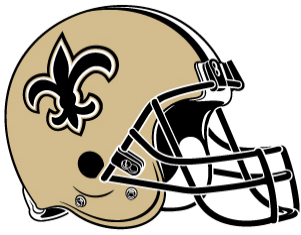
