## THE MATCHUP

The New Orleans Saints (7-8) will be rested and well-prepared after ten days away from the playing field when they face the Tampa Bay Buccaneers (8-7) in their final road regular season contest of the 2023 season. The Black and Gold are coming off of dropping a 30-22 decision to the Los Angeles Rams on Thursday night in a valiant effort where they fought back from a 30-7 fourth quarter deficit to be within eight points compliments of big plays on offense, defense and special teams.

A victory on Sunday will be crucial for the postseason hopes of New Orleans who remains one game behind the 8-7 Buccaneers and in the same spot as the 7-8 Atlanta Falcons in a competitive NFC South division race if the Saints want to reach the postseason for the first time since 2020.

The Saints will play at the Buccaneers looking to avenge a 26-9 loss to their division rival at the Caesars Superdome on October 1, leading the all-time series 39-24 and looking to avoid two consecutive season sweeps for the first time since the two clubs joined the NFC South in 2002. In order to capture the NFC South title, New Orleans needs to win their final two games of the season at Tampa Bay and vs. Atlanta, combined with a Week 18 Buccaneers loss to the Carolina Panthers.

The Saints enter the contest still making a strong push for the division led by Head Coach **Dennis Allen**, who helped reverse the tide of a three-game losing streak by winning two straight contests at home in December, while not surrendering a touchdown prior to the Thursday night loss, where New Orleans was missing four starters on offense and defense.

Despite falling behind early on Thursday night, New Orleans rebounded from the 30-7 deficit to come within eight points with 3:55 remaining in the contest. Saints QB **Derek Carr** engineered a 12-play, 75-yard drive midway through the game's final period that ended with a five-yard touchdown pass to TE **Juwan Johnson**. When the Rams got the ball back, the New Orleans defense got them off the field and DB **J.T. Gray** forced an eight-yard punt. After getting the ball back, on the second play of the drive, Carr connected with rookie WR **A.T. Perry** on a 35-yard touchdown throw. Second-year WR **Chris Olave** combined with Perry and Johnson for offensive fireworks with nine receptions for 123 yards. Defensively, DE **Carl Granderson** extended his career-high and team-high sack total to 8.5 with one takedown.

## THE COACHES

**Dennis Allen** was hired as the 17th head coach in New Orleans Saints history on February 8, 2022. Now in his 28th year coaching and 21st in the NFL, Allen has spent 13 seasons in New Orleans in two separate stints, including the six-and-a-half campaigns (2015-21) as the team's defensive coordinator prior to being promoted to head coach. He succeeded Sean Payton, who coached the team for 16 seasons, including the 2009 campaign, when Allen was secondary coach and ended with the Super Bowl XLIV championship. When Allen took control of a Black and Gold defense in Week 11 of the 2015 season that was ranked 32nd both in opponent net yards per game and opponent points per game, he methodically molded a unit that has finished in the top 10 in both categories each of the last three years.

In his first year as head coach of the Saints, Allen guided New Orleans through the challenge of significant injuries at several positions to win three of their last four games after a Week 14 bye and give up 20 or fewer points in the final eight contests of the season, ten points apiece in the final three.

Carrying over to the 2023 season, Allen has helped the Saints establish complementary play on offense, defense and special teams, having New Orleans currently tied for second place in the NFC South heading into Sunday's pivotal division matchup at the NFC South-leading Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

Before rejoining the Saints coaching staff in 2015, Allen served as head coach of the Oakland Raiders from 2012-14 and as defensive coordinator of the Denver Broncos in 2011. Prior to his first stint in New Orleans from 2006-10, where he served as assistant defensive line coach from 2006-07 and as secondary coach from 2008-10, Allen was also an assistant with the Atlanta Falcons from 2002-05, where he received his NFL coaching start.

Over the course of his coaching career in New Orleans, Allen has coached LB Demario Davis and DE Cameron Jordan to career seasons. Davis has led the team in tackles in every campaign since signing with the club as an unrestricted free agent in 2018 and has garnered AP All-Pro honors four straight times. Since Allen returned to New Orleans in 2015, Jordan's 88.5 sacks rank third in the NFL.

Allen played safety at Texas A&M from 1992-95, where he started the final 21 games of his college career before being signed as an undrafted free agent by the Buffalo Bills in 1996. Prior to entering the National Football League coaching ranks in 2002, Allen served as a graduate assistant at his alma mater from 1996-99 and as secondary coach at the University of Tulsa from 2000-2001. He

earned a bachelor of business administration degree and a master's in kinesiology from Texas A&M.

Raised in Hurst, Texas, Allen and his wife, Alisson, have a daughter, Layla and a son, Garrison.

**Todd Bowles** was hired as the 13<sup>th</sup> head coach in Buccaneers history on March 30, 2022. He is in his second season as head coach and 28<sup>th</sup> in the NFL. In his first campaign in 2022, he led the Buccaneers to an 8-9 record and NFC South Division title.

Prior to his promotion, he spent the previous three seasons as defensive coordinator and was instrumental in helping Tampa Bay win Super Bowl LV against the Kansas City Chiefs, holding an Andy Reid and Patrick Mahomes offense to just nine points. Under his command, from 2019-2021 the defensive unit was third in the league in takeaways (82) and sacks (142) as one of only two teams in the league to be top five in both categories. In addition, the Buccaneers defense led the NFL in rushing yards allowed per game, yards per attempt, fumble recoveries, and passes defended. In six postseason games as DC during that span, his unit tallied 16 takeaways, seven more than any other club.

Bowles spent 2015-2018 as head coach of the New York Jets, where he led them to 10 wins in his first season. In the 2013-2014 seasons, he served as defensive coordinator for the Arizona Cardinals. During that span, Arizona's defense ranked top five in rushing touchdowns allowed, points per game, rushing yards per game and interceptions. In 2014, he was honored as AP and PFWA Assistant Coach of the Year.

Earlier in his career, Bowles served as Defensive Backs Coach/ Interim Defensive Coordinator for the Philadelphia Eagles (2012), Assistant Head Coach/Secondary Coach for the Miami Dolphins (2008-2011), Secondary Coach of the Dallas Cowboys (2005-2007), Secondary Coach for the Cleveland Browns (2004), Defensive Nickel Package Coach for the Browns (2001-2003) and Secondary Coach for the New York Jets (2000) after starting with the Green Bay Packers Player Personnel Staff (1995-1996).

Bowles got his start coaching in 1997 as defensive coordinator for Morehouse College and went on to serve the same role for Grambling State (1998-99).

He enjoyed an eight year NFL career at the safety position after going undrafted in 1986 out of Temple. He was a member of the Washington Redskins (1986-90, 1992-93), starting on the 1987 team that won Super Bowl XXII, while also playing for the San Francisco 49ers (1991).

A native of Elizabeth, N.J., Bowles was born on Nov. 18, 1963. He and his wife, Taneka, have three sons, Todd Jr., Troy and Tyson.

**SERIES HISTORY**

The Saints and Buccaneers first met in 1977. New Orleans has posted a 39-24 regular season record vs. Tampa Bay, the club's best winning percentage (.619) vs. an opponent they've played at least of eight games against.

**In the 63 games of the series there has been:**

- 2,133 points scored by New Orleans, 1,177 allowed.
- A seven-game regular season New Orleans winning streak from 2011-2014 and from 2018-2021.
- A 17-10 record for the Saints in games played in Tampa.
- 26 games decided by double-digits.
- Seven games decided by 21 or more points.
- 34 games decided by seven points or less.
- A 41-point win by New Orleans on December 16, 2012, the club's first shutout against the Buccaneers.
- Since both clubs joined the NFC South in 2002, New Orleans has swept the regular season series eight times.

## HALL OF FAME

### EVANS SEMIFINALIST FOR PRO FOOTBALL HALL

Former New Orleans Saints right guard Jahri Evans, currently serving as an offensive assistant on the coaching staff, is one of 25 Modern-Era Player Semifinalists for the Pro Football Hall of Fame's Class of 2024. Originally selected by New Orleans in the fourth round of the 2006 NFL Draft out of Division II Bloomsburg, Evans arrived in New Orleans and captured right guard duties in training camp. For his Black and Gold career, Evans started all 169 regular season games and ten postseason contests that he appeared in at right guard, finishing his career opening 14 contests at Green Bay in 2017. He was a five-time *Associated Press* All-Pro selection and was selected to six consecutive Pro Bowls from 2009-14. A 2010's selection to the All-Decade team, Evan's four first-team All-Pro selections are double that of any other player in Saints history.

### WEEK 9: CB Paulson Adebo

**New Orleans Saints 24, Chicago Bears 17 @ Caesars Stadium, Nov. 5, 2023**

Finished with seven tackles (five solo), two interceptions, three passes defensed, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery. Adebo's two interceptions marked a single-game career best, bringing his total to four interceptions on season, also marking a career-high. Contest marked the first time in his career that Adebo has recorded an interception in back to back weeks. Adebo also set a new career mark in passes defensed in a season with 11 total after nine weeks of action. Adebo's efforts in the secondary helped lead the defense to force five turnovers for the first time since 2020 regular season finale at Carolina, where the Black and Gold had a five-interception performance.

Assistant Offensive Line Coach **Kevin Carberry** - Prior to entering the coaching ranks, Carberry competed in training camps of the Cleveland Browns (2005) and Carolina Panthers (2006) and spent the 2005 season on the Detroit Lions practice squad. Offensive Assistant **Jahri Evans** - Evans was selected by the Saints in the fourth round (108th overall) of the 2006 NFL Draft and spent the first 11 seasons of his 12-year playing career with the Saints. Overall, he started 183 career regular season games at right guard for the Saints (2006-16) and Green Bay Packers (2017), 169 for the Black and Gold. Evans was a six-time Pro Bowl selection, a five-time *Associated Press* All-Pro and was named to the Pro Football Hall of Fame's 2020's All-Decade Team, as New Orleans finished in the Top Ten in total offense each of the 11 seasons he lined up for the Saints, while the 196 sacks surrendered by the offensive line over the period were the lowest in the NFC and second-lowest in the NFL. After being selected as a consensus All-Rookie in 2006, Evans was a Pro Bowl starter and consensus first-team All-Pro each season from 2009-12. He was inducted into the Saints Hall of Fame in 2020, the Louisiana Sports Hall of Fame in 2022, was a semifinalist for the Pro Football Hall of Fame's Class of 2023 and was just announced as a semifinalist for the Class of 2024.

Defensive Assistant **Matt Giordano** - Giordano was a fourth round draft pick of the Indianapolis Colts in 2005 and enjoyed a nine-year NFL career with the Colts (2005-08), Green Bay Packers (2009), Saints (2010), Oakland Raiders (2011-12) and St. Louis Rams (2013), starting 30-of-116 career games, accumulating 202 tackles, one sack, 11 interceptions, including two returned for touchdowns, 16 passes defensed, two forced fumbles, 52 special teams stop and one coverage fumble recovery. He also appeared in seven postseason games for the Colts and Packers and was a member of Indianapolis' Super Bowl XLI championship team.

Secondary Coach **Marcus Robertson** - Robertson played in the NFL for 12 years with the Houston Oilers/Tennessee Titans (1991-00) and the Seattle Seahawks (2001-02) after entering the league with Houston as a fourth-round selection (102nd overall) in the 1991 NFL Draft out of Iowa State. Robertson was an *Associated Press* first-team All-Pro at free safety in 1993 and 1997. The Pasadena, Calif. native finished his playing career with the Seattle Seahawks from 2001-02.

Pass Rush Specialist **Brian Young** - Played in the National Football League from 2000-08 with the St. Louis Rams his first four seasons, who originally selected him in the fifth round of the 2000 NFL Draft (139th overall) from Texas-El Paso and final five campaigns with the Saints, playing in 124 games, recording 22.5 career sacks and eight fumble recoveries. career by appearing in 162 games (144

starts), collecting 24 interceptions, 72 passes defensed, 11 fumble recoveries, nine forced fumbles and 795 tackles (638 solo).

## ROSTER ROLL CALL

On the 53-player Saints active roster as of December 11, 31 were on the active roster, a reserve list or the practice squad at the end of the 2022 season. Among newcomers, the roster includes four unrestricted free agents, 14 veteran free agents, six draft picks, one waiver acquisition and four rookie free agents.

Of the players, 31 have less than four years of previous NFL experience, including eight players who were in their first training camp or preseason. ## SHUTOUT CITY

New Orleans rebounded from a 26-9 loss to Tampa Bay on October 1 with a 34-0 shutout victory over New England on October 8 with significant contributions on defense that played turnover free football, defense that forced three turnovers and special teams that won the field position battle. The shutout victory was the largest margin of victory in

a shutout at New England in their franchise's history. Including a 9-0 win at Tampa Bay on December 9, 2021 and a 24-0 win on October 30, 2022, the Saints are the only NFL team to have three shutouts in the past three seasons. Buffalo and New England (2) are the only other NFL teams to have multiple shutouts in the past three seasons.

## OPPONENT POINTS PER GAME

After ranking in the top 10 in opponent points per game in 2020 and 2021, New Orleans had slipped in 2022 to 31st (28.9 ppg.), going into the Week Eight contest vs. Las Vegas. Since that 24-0 shutout of the Raiders, New Orleans is ranked third in the NFL opponent points per game (17.2 ppg.), moving up to ninth overall to conclude 2022.

## BUCKING THE ODDS

The Saints have a long tradition of finding players as free agents signed after the draft that make an impact immediately or developing their careers initially on the team’s practice squad. Several undrafted Saints on the roster play key roles on offense, defense and special teams that the club developed.

Wide Receiver/Return Specialist **Rashid Shaheed** came to New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Weber State in 2022 after being one of the all-time best Division FCS returners and after spending the first five weeks on the practice squad, made an immediate impact, becoming the only Saint to score a touchdown in each of his first two offensive touches. In the Dec. 18 win over Atlanta, he finished with three receptions for 95 yards, with a 68-yard touchdown grab from Taysom Hill, the longest play from scrimmage of the season for New Orleans and the fifth-longest receiving TD by a Saints rookie all-time. On the Christmas Eve win at Cleveland in challenging conditions, Shaheed led the team in receiving with four grabs for 41 yards. In the Jan. 1 victory at Philadelphia, he led the team in receiving for the third consecutive week, posting six receptions for 79 yards, including a 58-yard grab to set up a field goal. Overall, he carried four times for 57 yards with a 44-yard touchdown, caught 28 passes for 488 yards (17.4 avg.) with two TDs, returned 20 punts for 193 yards (9.7 avg.) and returned 14 kickoffs for 320 yards (22.9 avg.).

In 2023, Shaheed is no longer a secret, as he has caught 41 passes for 640 yards (15.6 avg.) with four touchdown grabs, including seven receptions of 40-or-more yards, while also carrying seven times for 37 yards and ranking second in the NFC and third in the NFL in punt return average (14.0) and ninth in the league in all purpose yards (1,240) despite missing two contests with a quad injury. On Sept. 24 in Green Bay, he had his first career punt return for a touchdown, the second-longest scoring return in franchise history (76 yards). Oct. 1, vs. Tampa Bay, Shaheed had a 29-yard return, making him the first Saint to have a return of at least 25 yards in back to back contests since Darren Sproles (9/25-10/2/11).

Oct. 29, at Indianapolis, Shaheed had a breakout performance, catching three passes for 153 yards (51.0 avg.), including a 58-yard touchdown grab. Shaheed's 51.0 yards per reception average was ranked third in team history as he became only the third Saint to record 150+ yards receiving on three catches. Shaheed also added four punt returns for 46 yards to total 199 all-purpose yards.

TE **Juwan Johnson** led his position group with four touchdown receptions in 2021, converting to the position after

playing wide receiver in college and starting his Black and Gold career in 2020 signing as an undrafted free agent from Oregon. In 2022, he led his position group in receiving with 42 grabs for 508 yards with a club-best and career-high seven touchdowns, tied for third at the position in the NFL. Johnson leads the tight ends with 26 grabs for 238 yards with three touchdowns in 2023.

DE **Carl Granderson** played in 15 games in 2021 with three starts and posted 24 tackles and three sacks. In 2022, he posted 53 stops (30 solo) and a career-high 5.5 sacks, recovering the first fumble of his career, December 5 at Tampa Bay. In the Christmas Eve victory at Cleveland, Granderson, sacked Browns QB Deshaun Watson at the Saints 22-yard line on fourth down with 19 seconds remaining in the fourth quarter to secure the win. The following week on January 1, 2023 at Philadelphia, he posted two stops, 1.5 sacks of QB Gardner Minshew, one stop for loss and two quarterback hits, as Granderson posted at least half a takedown in three consecutive weeks for the first time in his career.

Earning the starting right defensive end position in 2023, Granderson has posted a career-high 73 tackles, leads the team with a career-best 8.5 sacks, had defended one pass and has forced a fumble and recovered one, signing a four-year contract extension on September 23.

P **Lou Hedley** was signed following the 2023 NFL Draft by the Saints out of the University of Miami, where he played from 2019-22 and punted 206 times for 9,315 yards with a 45.2 gross punting average and 77 inside-the-20. The Australia native, who won the punting job in a competition in training camp at 30 years old earned All-ACC second-team honors in 2021 and was selected as a semifinalist for the Ray Guy Award, honoring the nation's top punter. In 2020, Hedley was recognized with AP second-team All-American and as a Ray Guy Award finalist, as the Hurricanes ranked second in FBS in net punting average. In 2023, he's punted 65 times for 2,773 yards with a 42.7 gross punting average, a 39.2 net and 27 inside the 20-yard line.

K **Blake Grupe** was signed by New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Notre Dame, where he played his graduate campaign in 2022, after handling kicking duties at Arkansas State from 2017-21. In 2022, he led the Fighting Irish with 91 points on 14-of-19 field goals and a perfect 49-for-49 in PATs. The Missouri native was Arkansas State's career record holder in scoring (354), field goals (64) and PATs (162).

In 13 games, Grupe has made 25 of 32 field goal attempts and all 32 PAT attempts to lead the team with 105 points, with 61 touchbacks on kickoffs, tied for eighth in the NFL.

Grupe enjoyed a standout performance in the Oct. 8 34-0 shutout at New England with a career-long 54-yard field goal and a 53-yarder and hitting all four PATs to go with five of his seven kickoffs sailing into the end zone for touchbacks. Grupe became the first Saint to boot two field goals of at least 50 yards in a contest since John Carney (at St Louis, 9/26/04), only the fifth Saint to do so overall and only the sixth occurrence. He earned NFC Special Teams Player of the Week.

On Nov. 26 at Atlanta, Grupe drilled a career-high five field goals, the ninth time a Saint has kicked five field goals, the first time a Saints rookie has, as he scored all of New Orleans' 15 points.

Wide Receiver **Keith Kirkwood** originally joined the Saints as an undrafted free agent out of Temple in 2018. The New Jersey native spent the first two months of his rookie season on the New Orleans practice squad, before being signed to the active roster at midseason and recording 13 receptions for 209 yards (16.1 avg.) with two touchdowns. He added one more scoring grab in the NFC Divisional playoff win over Philadelphia to help the Saints advance to the NFC Championship. After spending most of the 2019 campaign on Injured Reserve and playing for Carolina from 2020-21, Kirkwood returned to New Orleans in 2022, where he contributed on offense and special teams. In the 2023 preseason opening win over Kansas City, he caught a four-yard touchdown pass from QB Derek Carr. On Nov. 26 at Atlanta, he contributed with two grabs for 21 yards and had a special teams stop. On Dec. 17, vs. The New York Giants, he started and caught a seven-yard touchdown pass, his first scoring grab since 2018.

### PRACTICE MAKES PERFECT

A spot on the practice squad is another avenue to eventually get onto the active roster and have the opportunity to contribute. Below is an overview of seven key contributors players on the club's 53-man roster with extensive practice squad experience.

TE **Juwan Johnson** was signed by New Orleans out of Oregon, where he spent his graduate transfer season, following the 2020 NFL Draft as a wideout. Recording four receptions for 39 yards in seven contests, Johnson spent the majority of his rookie season on the practice squad. Converted to tight end in 2021 and leading the position group with four touchdowns, Johnson took advantage of his first full offseason strength and conditioning program in 2022, led the tight ends group with 42 receptions for 508 yards with a club-best seven TD grabs, tied for third in the league at his position. In 2023, Johnson leads the tight ends with 26 grabs for 238 yards and three touchdowns despite missing four games with a calf injury.

After spending his first three seasons with the Seattle Seahawks, contributing on defense and special teams, DB **Ugo Amadi** split the 2022 campaign between the Titans active roster and the Chiefs practice squad, also appearing in one contest for Super Bowl champion Kansas City. Possessing the versatility to play in multiple roles, Amadi secured a roster spot with the Saints in the preseason, recording eight tackles, one interception, two passes defended and one coverage stop. He's contributed on defense with four tackles and two passes defended and on special teams with two stops in all 15 contests.

After splitting his rookie season in 2018 between the practice squad and active roster, DB **J.T. Gray** enjoyed a

breakthrough campaign in 2019, when he was selected AP second-team All-Pro when he recorded 16 special teams tackles, a blocked punt and a coverage fumble recovery. In 2021, he was selected as a first-team All-Pro and to his first career Pro Bowl (starter), when he led the NFL with 19 special teams tackles (league-leading 16 solo). Gray led the team with 12 coverage stops in 2022, despite missing three games (hamstring), the third time in four seasons he led New Orleans in coverage tackles. He has a team-high ten special teams stops and one defensive tackle in 2023 despite missing three games. On Thursday night at the L.A. Rams, Gray got his hands on a punt that landed for only an eight-yard gain. Backed by Gray's performance, leadership and knowledge, New Orleans is ranked first in the NFL in opponent punt return average (5.2).

WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed** came to New Orleans as one of the all-time best Division I-AA returners and after spending the first five weeks on the practice squad, made a quick impact on Oct. 16 vs. Cincinnati with a 44-yard rushing TD. With his 53-yard receiving TD on Oct. 20 at Arizona, Shaheed became the only Saint to score touchdowns on each of his first two career offensive touches. In addition to finishing with 28 grabs for 488 yards (17.4 avg.) with two TDs, Shaheed also handled return duties for New Orleans, bringing back 20 punts for 193 yards (9.7 avg.). He made contributions in the Sept. 10 opening win over Tennessee with a career-high 216 all-purpose yards, including five receptions for 89 yards, including a 19-yard touchdown and a late fourth quarter 41-yard grab to help secure the victory. In the Sept. 18 win over Carolina, he posted four catches for 63 yards (15.8 avg.), including a fourth quarter 45-yard grab. On Sept. 24 at Green Bay, Shaheed had a 76-yard punt return for a touchdown.

In 2023, Shaheed has caught 41 passes for 640 yards (15.6 avg.) with three touchdown receptions, to tie for the team lead, including a club-best seven grabs of 40-or-more yards, while also carrying seven times for 37 yards and ranking third in the NFL in punt return average (14.0) and eighth in the league in all-purpose yards (1,314).

WR **Keith Kirkwood** originally joined the Saints as an undrafted free agent out of Temple in 2018. The New Jersey native spent the first two months of his rookie season on the practice squad, before being signed to the active roster at midseason and recording 13 receptions for 209 yards (16.1 avg.) with two TDs. He added one more scoring grab in the NFC Divisional Playoff win over Philadelphia to help the Saints advance to the NFC Championship. After spending most of 2019 campaign on Injured Reserve and playing for Carolina from 2020-21, Kirkwood returned to New Orleans in 2022, where he has contributed on both offense and special teams. He scored his first touchdown in five seasons, a seven-yard pass from QB Derek Carr in the Dec. 17 24-6 victory over the New York Giants.

LB **Nephi Sewell** was signed by New Orleans following the 2022 NFL Draft out of Utah and appeared in four games as a rookie, contributing on special teams, while spending the remainder of the campaign on the practice squad. Sewell has progressed on both defense and special teams and secured a spot on the 53-man roster in 2023, posting five coverage tackles and one forced fumble and nine defensive stops

Originally a third round draft pick of the Broncos in 2018 out of Boston College, CB **Isaac Yiadom** has played in 85 games with 26 starts for Denver, the Giants, Green Bay, Houston and New Orleans and has posted 137 tackles, a split sack, two interceptions, 25 passes defensed, one forced fumble and 26 special teams stops. After starting 2022 with the Texans, Yiadom joined the Saints practice squad midway through the season and upon being signed to the active roster, recorded two special teams stops in six appearances.

In 2023, Yiadom has contributed on both defense and special teams, playing in all 15 games with six starts, recording 30 tackles, one interception, a career-high 13 passes defensed to rank second on the team and six coverage stops to also rank second on the team, tying his career-high.

On the following pages are a synopsis of several returning players and newcomers through the draft and free agency to the 2023 Saints offensive line:

**Right Tackle Ryan Ramczyk** - The Black and Gold used their second first round selection in the 2017 NFL Draft to snag Ramczyk out of Wisconsin, one of the best offensive linemen in the entire draft. After opening all 16 games and

both postseason contests in 2017 and being selected as a PFWA All-Rookie, he has been selected as an AP All-Pro selection three times since. After missing seven contests in 2021, Ramczyk rebounded to open the first 16 games in 2022 and continues to anchor the right side of the line, opening 12 contests in 2023.

**Tackle/Guard James Hurst** - A nine-year National Football League veteran who was signed as a free agent from Baltimore in 2020, Hurst has 147 career regular season appearances with 92 starts at four different positions on the inside and outside. His versatility came in handy in 2020, as he started two contests at left tackle and one at left guard, while the Saints gained over 200 yards rushing each time. In 2021, Hurst moved into the starting lineup for eight games at left tackle in place of an injured Armstead, two at left guard in place of an injured Andrus Peat and three at right tackle for an injured Ryan Ramczyk. Hurst started 15 games at left tackle and one at left guard in 2022. In 2023, Hurst has opened 11 games at left guard, including the last seven contests, one at left tackle and one at right guard.

Tackle/Guard **Andrus Peat** - A first round selection (13th overall) in the 2015 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Peat was considered one of the top college linemen in 2014. In nine seasons, he's played in 109 regular season games with 100 starts, opening a contest at every position except center. In 2020, he opened 13 contests at left guard as he was part of the NFC Pro squad for the third consecutive season. In 2021, he opened the first six contests, where New Orleans got off to a 4-2 start before suffering a season-ending pectoral injury. In his return to the starting lineup in the 2022 season opener in Atlanta, New Orleans rushed for 151 yards. In back-to-back weeks, Peat was a part of rushing efforts of 200-yards plus by the club for the first time since 2020. In 2023, Peat has started one contest at left guard and the last eight at left tackle as the offensive line has solidified with his return to the starting lineup.

**Center/Guard Erik McCoy** - New Orleans traded up in the second round of the 2019 NFL Draft to select this standout from Texas A&M, who was a three-year starter, anchoring the middle of the Aggies line. In 2018, he was a team captain who paved the way for the SEC's leading rusher and in 2019 was the first Saint in franchise history to start at center in Week One, opening all 16 contests. McCoy has opened all 72 contests he has appeared in at center and signed a five-year contract extension with the team in 2022, having been selected as an offensive team captain for the first time in 2023.

**Guard/Center Cesar Ruiz** - The hard-working, talented and intelligent lineman is a perfect fit for New Orleans' culture. He was selected with the 24th pick in the 2020 NFL Draft out of the University of Michigan. The three-year letterman played in 36 games in college, starting his last 31 including the final 26 at center, earning All-Big Ten in 2019. Ruiz settled in at right guard in the last 15 games, with nine starts, as well as both postseason contests. When McCoy suffered a lower leg injury in the first quarter of the 2021 opening win over Green Bay, Ruiz transitioned over to his natural position, where the Saints did not give up a sack in his four starts at center. He returned to right guard on Oct. 25 at Seattle and was the only lineman in 2021 to not miss a start. Ruiz opened 13 games at right guard and one at center in 2022 before suffering a season-ending foot injury Dec. 18, vs. Atlanta. The 46 consecutive starts for Ruiz at the time of his injury was the longest active streak for a Saint. Following an ardent rehab, Ruiz returned to the starting lineup for the season opener on September 10, the day after signing a four-year contract extension.

**Tackle Landon Young** - A mainstay at left tackle for his college career at the University of Kentucky, Young played in 49 contests with 30 starts in his college career. The Lexington, Ky. native was selected by New Orleans in the sixth round of the 2021 NFL Draft and held up to the competition in training camp to snare a roster spot. Young opened one contest at right tackle in 2021 and serves as Ramczyk's backup on the right side, also playing *jumbo tight* end. In 2022, Young showed versatility. On October 13 at Pittsburgh, he slide over to left tackle for the second half to replace Hurst (concussion) and opened this the November 20 win over the Rams at one of the league's most challenging positions. In the January 1, 2023 win at Philadelphia, Young played the final three quarters in place of Ramczyk (hip) and then started the following week's finale vs. Carolina. Young has opened the last two games in place of Ramczyk (knee).

**Guard/Center Max Garcia** - The nine-year National Football League veteran was signed as a free agent at the start of training camp. This versatile lineman has played in 120 regular season games with 62 starts for New Orleans, Arizona and Denver, including opening the three contests at left guard in 2023. Originally a fourth round draft pick of Denver out of the University of Florida in 2015, who started five contests as a rookie for the Super Bowl 50 champions, Garcia has opened 46 games at right guard, 12 at left guard and four at center.

**DEFENSIVE NOTES****IN THE NFL**

After finishing ranked seventh in the NFL in 2021, surrendering 318.2 net yards per game, the Saints defense returned to the top five again in 2022, ranking fifth, while giving up 314.8 net yards per game. New Orleans and San Francisco are the only two teams to rank in the top ten each of the last three seasons and this marked the third time the Saints have ranked in the top ten in total defense for three straight seasons (1982-84 and 1991-93).

WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed** had a 76-yard punt return for a touchdown at Green Bay on Sept. 24, the team's first punt return for a touchdown since 2019. On Dec. 10, vs. Carolina, LB **Nephi Sewell** forced Panthers P Johnny Hekker to fumble on a punt play, which was recovered by LB **D'Marco Jackson** for an eight-yard touchdown. The last time the Saints had three special teams touchdowns in a season was in 2008, when RB **Reggie Bush** returned three punts for touchdowns.

**COVERAGE UNITS**

New Orleans' coverage and block units in 2023 are led by defensive team co-captain DB **J.T. Gray**. Signed by the Saints following the 2018 NFL Draft out of Mississippi State, Gray enjoyed a banner campaign in 2021. Voted by teammates as the club's special teams captain for the first time, Gray led the NFL with 19 tackles in 16 games, as he was selected as a Pro Bowl starter and as the team's only first-team *Associated Press* All-Pro. Playing in 78 career games, Gray has career totals of 66 special teams stops, a blocked punt, three fumble recoveries and ten defensive tackles, 2.5 sacks and a pass defense, ranked first on the team with 12 coverage stops in 2022 despite missing three games (hamstring). In 2023, he has ten coverage stops to lead the team and tie for tenth in the NFL, despite missing three contests. Gray made a game-changing play on Thursday night at the L.A. Rams, when he got his hand on a punt to create an eight-yard punt and favorable field position to set up a fourth quarter touchdown.

A third round draft pick of the Denver Broncos in 2018 out of Boston College, in addition to starting 26 of his 85 career contests on defense and posting 137 tackles, a split sack, two interceptions, 25 passes defended and one forced fumble, **Isaac Yiadom** has recorded 26 career coverage stops for five teams. Brought up to the active roster during Gray's injury, Yiadom brought a boost to the Saints coverage units with three stops, remaining an integral part of the group after Gray's return to the lineup and re-signing in the offseason. In 2023, Yiadom is ranked third on the team with six special teams tackles, tying his career-high. On Oct. 29, at Indianapolis, Yiadom downed a punt at the Colts three-yard line in the third quarter. In the Nov. 5 win over Chicago, Yiadom played a key role on a punt with the Bears starting field position at their two-yard line.

One of the club's two third round draft picks in 2020, **Zack Baun**, a former Wisconsin standout, has embraced work on the team's special teams units. He has recorded 21 tackles on coverage, one blocked field goal and 61 defensive stops, one sack, one interception and one pass defense. On Sept. 10 at Tennessee, Baun got his hands on a punt that went out of bounds one yard past the line of scrimmage, a game-changing play.

Selected in the fifth round of the 2022 NFL Draft by the Saints out of Appalachian State, LB **D'Marco Jackson** came to New Orleans as the only Football Bowl Subdivision player with more than 200 tackles and 25 stops for loss in the 2020 and 2021 seasons combined. After missing his entire rookie campaign with a hamstring injury, Jackson's hard-working and hard-hitting mentality has proven to be a good fit on the team's coverage units as he is ranked second on the team with seven stops and the fumble recovery for a touchdown.

DB **Lonnie Johnson** was signed by New Orleans as a free agent in the offseason after spending his first three seasons with the Houston Texans and the 2022 campaign with the Tennessee Titans. Johnson has posted 19 career special teams stops, including five with New Orleans in 2023. On Oct. 19, at Jacksonville, Johnson had a fumble recovery off a muffed punt for his first career special teams takeaway.

Signed as an undrafted free agent in 2022 out of Utah, Sewell appeared in four games on special teams as a rookie. In 2023, the sure tackler secured a spot on the team's coverage units and is tied fourth on the team with five stops to go with nine defensive tackles and the Dec. 10 special teams forced fumble on a punt play.

Signed as a free agent at the start of the offseason, Amadi has career totals of 21 special teams stops and one forced fumble, recording his first two stops in coverage of 2023 in the past three weeks.

## QUARTERBACKS

### DEREK CARR

• On March 6, 2023 the Saints agreed to terms with Derek Carr on a four-year contract to solidify the quarterback position, He spent the first nine seasons of his NFL career with the Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders. Originally selected in the second round (36th overall) of the 2014 NFL Draft by the Raiders out of Fresno State, the Bakersfield, Calif. native has started all 157 career regular season games he has played in, completing 3,530-of-5,446 passes (64.8 percent) for 38,639 yards with 236 touchdown passes, 107 interceptions and a 91.9 passer rating, while adding 882 rushing yards and six touchdowns. From 2014-22 as a member of the Raiders, Carr was selected to four Pro Bowl Games (2015-17, 2022) and set numerous team passing records including the franchise's career passing yardage and touchdown pass marks and single-season mark in passing yards (4,804 in 2021), as the only signal-caller in the team's history with multiple seasons reaching the 4,000 yard mark. He also holds franchise records from his Raiders tenure for multiple-touchdown pass games (69), contests with a passer rating of at least 100.0 (47) and 300-yard passing performances (33).

• Since entering the league in 2014, Carr ranks second in the NFL in completions, fourth in passing yardage and seventh in passing touchdowns. He became the third quarterback in history to pass for 3,000-plus yards in each of his first ten seasons, joining Pro Football Hall of Fame signal-caller Peyton Manning and Russell Wilson. He is just the fourth player in NFL history to reach 35,000 passing yards in his first nine seasons. He has completed 300 passes of 25+ yards since he entered the league in 2014, the fourth-most in the NFL over that span. His 157 starts are the most by a quarterback since 2014.

• Carr has started all 15 games in 2023 and has completed 329-of-488 passes (67.4%) for 3,417 yards with 19 touchdowns, eight interceptions and a 93.6 passer rating.

• Carr enjoyed a successful Saints debut in the Sept. 10 win over Tennessee, when he completed 23-of-33 passes (69.7%) for 305 yards with one touchdown, one interception and a 96.1 passer rating.

• Carr helped lead New Orleans to a 20-17 victory at Carolina on Monday Night Football on Sept. 18, when in the second half, he completed a 42-yard pass to Chris Olave and a 45-yard pass to Rashid Shaheed to set up the Saints' two touchdowns.

• On Sept. 24 at Green Bay, Carr had completed 13-of-18 (72.2%) of his passes for 103 yards with an eight-yard scoring throw to TE Jimmy Graham and a 104.6 passer rating to help put New Orleans ahead 17-0 over the Packers before being forced to leave in the third quarter with a sprained AC joint injury.

• Carr was a model of efficiency in the Oct. 8 34-0 shutout of New England, completing 18-of-26 passes (69.2%) for 183 yards with two touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 114.7 passer rating, his highest as a Saint to date.

• On Oct. 15 at Houston, Carr finished 32-of-50 passing (64.0 pct.) for 353 yards, one touchdown and one interception, also carrying two yards for a first down. It was the tenth-highest passing yardage total of Carr's career and his highest total as a Saint to date.

• On Oct. 19 vs. Jacksonville, Carr completed 33-of-55 passes for 301 yards with a 17-yard touchdown to Michael Thomas, as he became the first Saints passer to have back-to-back weeks of at least 300 yards passing since Drew Brees in Weeks 14 and 15 of the 2019 campaign.

• In the Oct. 29 win at Indianapolis, Carr was in complete control, as he completed 19-of-27 passes for 310 yards with two touchdowns, including a 58-yard touchdown pass to Shaheed, one of two completions of 50-yards or more to the speedster, as he became the first Saints passer to have three consecutive weeks of at least 300 yards passing since Brees did so in four straight from Dec. 21, 2015-Sept. 11, 2016. It was also the first time Carr threw for 300 yards in three straight contests since Weeks One-Three of 2021.

• In the Nov. 5 24-17 win over Chicago, Carr completed 25-of-34 passes (73.5%) for 211 yards, two TDs and a 108.8 passer rating. Carr engineered a fourth quarter, go-ahead, game-winning drive, where he completed both passing attempts for 18 yards.

• On Nov. 26, at Atlanta, Carr completed 24-of-38 passes for 304 yards with three completions of 25 yards or more for his fifth performance of at least 300 yards of the season.

• On Dec. 3, vs. Detroit, Carr completed 17-of-22 passes (77.3%) for 226 yards with one touchdown and a 105.5 passer rating, as he completed his final 15 attempts.

• On Dec. 10, vs. Carolina, Carr completed 18-of-26 passes for 119 yards with touchdown passes to Jimmy Graham and Chris Olave to help New Orleans to the season sweep over the Panthers.

• On Dec. 17, vs. the New York Giants, despite the absence of the team's top two wide receivers on the depth chart, Carr completed passes to ten different teammates, going 23-of-28 for 218 yards with three touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 134.8 passer rating to lead the Saints to their second straight victory. Carr set season-highs in completion percentage (82.1), scoring throws and passer rating.

• On Dec. 21 at the Los Angeles Rams, Carr completed 27-of-40 passes for 319 yards with three touchdowns, one interception and a 106.1 passer rating, as he reached the century mark in back-to-back occasions for the second time this season.

## JAMEIS WINSTON

- The 2013 Heisman Trophy winner at Florida State and the first pick in the 2015 NFL Draft, Winston has appeared in 92 games with 80 starts, completing 1,763-of-2,882 passes (61.2%) for 22,104 yards with 141 touchdowns, 99 interceptions and an 87.0 rating, adding 1,214 rushing yards and 11 touchdowns. In 2021, before suffering a season-ending knee injury in Week Eight, Winston completed 95-of-161 passes for 1,170 yards, 14 touchdowns, three interceptions and a 102.8 passer rating, ranked first in the NFL at the time of his injury in touchdown percentage (8.7).

- Serving as the backup to Carr with extensive starting experience, Winston has completed 25-of-47 passes for 264 yards with two touchdowns and three interceptions.

## TAYSOM HILL

- Hill's brought unheralded versatility to offense and special teams. A participant on special teams from midseason in 2017, as well as a signal-caller and as a runner and receiver, Hill has played in 95 regular season games with 40 starts at several positions. He has carried 390 times for 2,107 yards, the most by a Saint not to play running back, with 27 touchdowns, tied for seventh in club records, caught 70 passes for 698 yards with ten touchdowns, completed 190-of-296 passes (64.2%) for 2,337 yards with 11 touchdowns, returned 19 kickoffs for 447 yards, made 15 special teams tackles and one blocked punt.

- In 2022, Hill assisted in multiple facets. Contributing on offense and special teams in the opener at Atlanta, he carried four times for a club-best 81 yards (20.3 avg.), including a career-long 57-yard carry, as well as an 11-yard rushing TD on the same first quarter drive. Overall, he ranked second on the team in rushing with 96 carries for a career-high 575 yards (club-best 6.0 avg.) with a club-best seven rushing TDs, nine catches for 75 yards with two TDs, leading the team in total TDs, while completing 13-of-19 passes for 240 yards with two TDs and a 146.3 passer rating.

- In 2023, Hill ranks second on the team in rushing with 73 carries for 349 yards (4.8 avg.) with four touchdowns, has caught a career-high 27 passes for 233 yards with one touchdown, has completed five of nine passes for 72 yards with one touchdown with a 118.8 passer rating, has returned a kickoff 18 yards and has one special teams tackle.

- In 12 games in 2023, Kamara leads New Orleans in rushing with 170 carries for 649 yards and a club-best five touchdowns, leading National Football League running backs in receiving with 73 receptions for 462 yards with one touchdown for a club-best 1,111 total yards from scrimmage and six total touchdowns.

## RENAISSANCE MAN

Hill enjoyed an all-around standout versatile performance in the November 5 win over Chicago, when he led the team in rushing, carrying 11 times for 52 yards (4.7 avg.), completed a three-yard touchdown pass to tight end Juwan Johnson and caught four passes for 13 yards with one touchdown. With his touchdown reception from Carr, the tenth of his career, Hill became the first player since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger and the first player since quarterback/halfback Frank Gifford to have at least ten career rushing touchdowns, passing touchdowns and receiving touchdowns. Hill has 27 rushing touchdowns, 11 touchdown passes and ten touchdowns in his career and became the second player in NFL history with at least 25 rushing touchdowns, ten touchdown passes and ten touchdown receptions, joining Gifford (34 rushing touchdowns, 14 touchdown passes and 43 touchdown receptions). Given the historical element of Hill's accomplishments, the Pro Football Hall of Fame has requested several items that were worn and used by Hill in his historic performance that now stands as an exhibit to fans at the museum.

## RUNNING BACKS

### ALVIN KAMARA

- A talented runner and receiver with a 5-10, 215-pound frame who was selected by the Saints in the third round of the 2017 NFL Draft out of the University of Tennessee, Kamara enjoyed an outstanding rookie campaign. He ranked first on the club and sixth in the NFL in yards from scrimmage (1,554), second on the team in rushing and receiving, carrying 120 times for 728 yards (6.1 avg.) with eight TDs and a two-point conversion, catching 81 passes for 826 yards (10.2 avg.) with five TDs and a kickoff return for a TD for a club rookie record 14 total scores, tied for second in the NFL. Kamara finished first in the NFL in yards per carry.

- Kamara was the first Saints offensive rookie selected to the Pro Bowl since Rueben Mayes (1986), as an AP second team All-Pro (flex), the clubs' first rookie All-Pro since 1993. He was named *The Sporting News* NFL Rookie of the Year and AP NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year.

## SCRIMMAGE LEADER

Since entering the NFL in 2017, Kamara ranks third in the league in total yards from scrimmage (9,999). Kamara is the first NFL player since Julio Jones (2014-19) to have six consecutive seasons of at least 1,300 total yards from scrimmage.

Out of his 78 career touchdowns, 11 (seven rushing, three receiving and one kickoff return) have come against Sunday's opponent, Tampa Bay, the most against an opponent by Kamara. Kamara's 11 touchdowns against Tampa Bay since 2017 are the most that an opposing player has scored against the Buccaneers during that period.

## TOUCHDOWN LEADER

In the Saints' 2020 Christmas Day 52-33 win over Minnesota, Kamara tied the NFL record for total touchdowns and rushing touchdowns (6), as he carried 22 times for a career-high 155 yards (7.0 avg.), adding three receptions for 17 yards for 172 yards from scrimmage. The rushing touchdowns record tied the record held by Ernie Nevers of the Chicago Cardinals since Nov. 28, 1929, while for total touchdowns, Kamara joins Nevers, Cleveland's Dub Jones (Nov. 25, 1951) and Chicago's Gayle Sayers (Dec. 12, 1965). The performance catapulted Kamara to the NFL's touchdown lead, as he joined running back Dalton Hilliard as only the second Saint to lead the league in touchdowns.

## THIRD THROUGH FIVE

After Kamara's two-touchdown performance in the 2021 Week Five win over Washington, Kamara's 19 career games with at least two touchdowns are tied with four players for the third-most such games by a player in his first five seasons in NFL history. Only Pro Football Hall of Famers Ladainian Tomlinson (21) and Emmitt Smith (20) had more than Kamara's total from 2017-21.

## TEN OF ONE OF EACH

With the one rushing touchdown, two receiving touchdown performance in an Oct. 30, 2022 victory over Las Vegas, Kamara along with Christian McCaffrey on the same day became the first two players in NFL history to have at least 10 games with at least one rushing and one receiving TD in their first seven seasons. ## JAMAAL WILLIAMS

- Signed by the Saints as an unrestricted free agent from Detroit in the offseason, Williams is a talented runner who had a breakout season in 2022, as he led the National Football League and set a Lions single-season franchise record for rushing touchdowns with 17. In 17 games with nine starts for Detroit, Williams added on 262 attempts for 1,066 rushing yards and 12 receptions for 73 yards, producing the first 1,000 yard rushing season of his career.

- The former BYU star's talent came consistently all over the field, as well as in short bursts, as ten of his rushing touchdowns in 2022 came from exactly one yard out, tied for third-most in NFL history. A sound ballcarrier, he went 752 career touches before fumbling the ball and became the league's first active running back to reach 600 carries before fumbling.

- Since being drafted by Green Bay in the fourth round (134th overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft, Williams has played in 101 games with 43 starts, totaling 988 attempts for 3,874 yards and 30 touchdowns, while adding 171 receptions for 1,232 yards and eight touchdowns against only five fumbles.

After a return to action in Week Seven, Williams overall has played in 11 games with three starts and rushed for 222 yards, forming a rushing trio with Kamara and his former college teammate, Hill.

## WIDE RECEIVERS

### CHRIS OLAVE

• A talented wide receiver who became one of the most prolific receivers in Buckeyes history, Olave played in 47 games and caught 176 passes for 2,711 yards (15.4 avg.) with 35 touchdowns. Olave’s 35 career touchdown receptions set an Ohio State program record and ranks fourth in Big Ten history. His 11 career 100-yard games also ranks second in school history. Olave entered the starting lineup in 2019 with immediate results. He helped lead the Buckeyes to three consecutive Big Ten championships (2018-2020) and back-to-back College Football Playoff appearances (2019, 2020). In the 2020 CFP Semifinal vs. Clemson, Olave had a career night, hauling in six passes for 132 yards and two touchdowns in a 49-28 win, securing a bid to play in the championship game. Olave seamlessly integrated into the Saints offense following a standout senior campaign, where he caught 65 passes for 936 yards (14.4 avg.) and 13 touchdowns, tied for sixth nationally, as he was selected as an AFCA first-team All-American and a consensus second-team All-American.

• Following a September, where he captured NFL Offensive Rookie of the Month honors with 17 grabs for a league rookie-best 268 yards, including scoring receiving touchdowns in back to back contests, Olave led the team in receiving, yards per catch and receiving yardage with 72 grabs for 1,042 yards (14.5 avg.) with four touchdowns along with a successful two-point conversion, ranking second among rookies in receiving yardage and tied for second in catches and third down grabs (26). Olave became the first Saints rookie since Danny Abramowicz (1967) to lead the team in receiving, receiving yardage and yards per catch in his first campaign. The receiving yardage total was second all-time among Saints rookies, as he was only the third Black and Gold rookie to reach 1,000.

## STARRY SOPHOMORE

Olave has picked up right where he left off from his rookie campaign in 2023, as he leads the team in receiving, receiving yardage and is tied for the lead in touchdown grabs with 81 receptions for 1,041 yards (12.9 avg.) with four touchdowns.

## TIGHT ENDS

### JUWAN JOHNSON

- The former Penn State and Oregon wideout joined the Saints in 2020 following the NFL Draft and transitioned to tight end his second season. In 2022, the New Jersey native had a breakout campaign as he appeared in 16 games with 12 starts and finished with 42 receptions for 508 yards and a team-best seven touchdown grabs. Johnson's touchdown grab total was tied for third among National Football League tight ends. Overall, Johnson's 14 touchdown grabs since 2021 lead the team.

- In 11 games with nine starts in 2023, Johnson has 26 receptions for 238 yards with three touchdowns to lead the tight end corps in all major receiving categories. After missing four contests with a calf injury, Johnson's returned to action Oct. 29 and has been an asset as a receiver and a blocker.

### FOSTER MOREAU

- This veteran tight end and New Orleans native enters his fifth National Football League season and first with the Black and Gold after spending his first four seasons with the Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders. In his career, Moreau has appeared in 74 regular season games with 43 starts and has recorded 110 receptions for 1,284 yards (11.7 avg.) with 13 touchdowns and has posted at least 30 catches in each of his last two campaigns. In 2022, the former Jesuit High School and LSU standout set career-highs in receptions (33) and receiving yards (420), while adding two touchdowns.

- Moreau got on the scoreboard for the first time as a Saint on Oct. 8 at New England with a fourth quarter six-yard grab. He has 19 grabs for 177 yards to rank second among Saints tight ends in receptions and receiving yardage, with one scoring grab.



**JIMMY GRAHAM**

• New Orleans’ third round draft choice in 2010 after playing four years of basketball and just one year of football at the University of Miami (Fla.). Graham broke out in his second year with the Saints totaling 99 catches for 1,310 yards with 11 touchdowns and went on to lead the team in receiving for four consecutive seasons. Graham’s production has been among the top 10 in NFL history at the tight end position in all three major categories: receptions, yards, and receiving touchdowns. Graham posts career totals of 719 receptions, 8,545 yards, and 89 touchdowns. His 89 receiving touchdowns rank 4<sup>th</sup> all time among NFL tight ends, while his 55 touchdowns as a Saint rank 2<sup>nd</sup> in franchise history. He and Kansas City’s Travis Kelce are the only two tight ends in NFL history to have multiple seasons of 1,200-plus receiving yards and 10- plus receiving touchdowns. Graham returns to New Orleans, the location of his most personal and team success, after playing in seven campaigns with three other teams and is tied for the team lead with four scoring grabs

On Sept. 24 at Green Bay, Jordan played in his 206th game, passing Thomas Morstead for sole possession of second in club record books. Oct. 29, at Indianapolis, Jordan became only the second Saint, first defensive Saint and 57th NFL defensive lineman to play in 200 career regular season contests. Nov. 5 vs. Chicago, he became only the second Saint to start 200 career regular season. Thursday night vs. Los

Angeles, Jordan is expected to appear in his 208th career regular season contest, moving into a tie for 34th all-time among league defensive linemen with Merlin Olsen, Kelvin Pritchett and Bryant Young.

# LINEBACKERS

## DEMARIO DAVIS

• This dependable and sure-tackling defender joined the New Orleans Saints in 2018 after spending his first six National Football League seasons with the New York Jets and Cleveland Browns. For his career, the Brandon, Miss. native has appeared in 192 career regular season games with 178 starts for the Jets (2012-15, 2017), Cleveland (2016) and the Saints (2018-), recording 1,322 stops (853 solo), 42.5 sacks, three interceptions, 55 passes defended, four forced fumbles, seven fumble recoveries and 24 special teams tackles. In 2023, Davis joined Bobby Wagner and Lavonte David as only the third active NFL player with 1,300.

• In 2018, Davis opened all 16 contests and led the team with 110 stops (74 solo), five sacks to lead the linebackers, four passes defended, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. Davis' abilities to diagnose and tackle played a key role in New Orleans ranking second in the NFL in opponent rushing yards per game and opponent rushing yards per play. Participating in the postseason for the first time, Davis led the defense with 22 stops (15 solo), an interception in the NFC Championship and a pass defense.

• In 2019, he posted 111 stops, ranked first on the club, four sacks, one interception and 11 passes defended to help spur the league's fourth-ranked run defense.

**IRON MAN**

Davis who had never missed a game in his career until December 27, 2021 vs. Miami due to COVID-19 protocols, ranks as one of the league's most durable defenders, while playing one of the game's most physically demanding positions. His 158 consecutive games played streak was the longest in the NFL by a position player and his 79 straight games started were the most at his position. In 2022, Davis was one of three Black and Gold starting defenders to open every contest, joining safety Tyrann Mathieu and defensive tackle David Onyemata. More impressive, he was the only linebacker in the NFL to play in every defensive snap for his teams.

**PETE WERNER**

- New Orleans selected this three-year starter from Ohio State in the second round of the 2021 NFL Draft. The Indianapolis native finished his college career playing in 47 career games with 35 starts, recording 185 tackles (111 solo), 16 stops for loss, four sacks, 11 passes defended, four forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Werner helped power the Buckeyes to the College Football Playoff championship game as a senior in 2020, when he was voted by Big Ten coaches as a first-team All-Conference selection and a Butkus Award semifinalist, posting 54 tackles, 2.5 stops for loss, one sack and two forced fumbles. Werner made his second career start Oct. 3 vs. the Giants and recorded a ten tackles. With 13 stops in Week Five at Washington, he became the first Saints rookie defender to reach double-digit totals in back-to-back games. He ranked fifth on the team with 59 tackles.

- Werner enjoyed a standout 2022 season, appearing in 12 games with 11 starts at weakside linebacker and ranked third on the team and second at the linebacker position, despite missing five games, with 79 tackles (55 solo), three stop for loss, three passes defended, two forced fumbles and one special teams tackle.

- Werner got off to an impressive start for the 2023 season, finishing second on the team with eight stops in the Sept.

10 season-opening win over Tennessee, one stop for loss and a split sack, his first career takedown. He recorded his first career interception this on October 8 in a 34-0 shutout at New England. Leading or tying for the team lead in stops in the last three contests, Werner is ranked second on the team with 80 stops, a split sack, one interception, one pass defense and two fumble recoveries, the most recent which took place in the first half of the Dec. 10 28-6 win over Carolina.

**S TYRANN MATHIEU**

- This versatile, hard-hitting, playmaking safety and New Orleans native returned home, signing after the draft and brings extensive experience to the secondary. Mathieu was selected by the Arizona Cardinals in the third round (69th overall) in the 2013 NFL Draft out of LSU and has played for the Cardinals (2013-17), Houston Texans (2018), Kansas City Chiefs (2019-21) and now the Saints. In 11 NFL seasons, he has played in 161 regular season games with 152 starts and has posted career totals of 764 tackles (630 solo), 42 stops for loss, ten sacks for a loss of 78 yards, 32 interceptions for 427 returns yards, four brought back for touchdowns, 98 passes defended, four forced fumbles, seven fumble recoveries and five special teams stops. Mathieu has been selected to three Pro Bowls, three Associated Press All-Pro teams and the Pro Football Hall of Fame's 2010's All-Decade Team.

**SECONDARY**

Mathieu came to New Orleans after starting all 16 games he played in for Kansas City in 2021 and recording 76 tackles, one sack, a career-high three fumble recoveries, one sack and two interceptions to earn his second consecutive Pro Bowl selection. With a team-leading three picks and one fumble recovery, adding up to a team-best four takeaways to go with a career-high 91 tackles (club-best 64 solo) to rank third on the team and first in the secondary.

Mathieu's 32 picks since coming into the league in 2013 are tied for second in the National Football League after recording two picks for the fourth time in his career on November 26 at Atlanta. With three interceptions in 2023, Mathieu is second on the team.

**CB PAULSON ADEBO**

• New Orleans’ third round selection (76th overall) in the 2021 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Adebo overcame not playing college football in 2020 to make significant contributions to the Saints secondary in his first season with the club. The Texas native finished his college career playing in 22 games with 21 starts for Stanford and recording 97 tackles, 34 passes defended and eight interceptions, earning All-Pac 12 honors in both 2018 and 2019.

• Adebo showed his development by opening opposite Lattimore in the 2021 regular season opening win vs. Green Bay and returning a pick 33 yards in the third quarter to become the first Saints defender to have an interception in his NFL debut since LB James Allen vs. Tampa Bay on September 8, 2002. He then added a second pick in the Week Five win at Washington. With a pick in the regular season finale at Atlanta, Adebo finished his rookie campaign ranked fifth on the club with 63 tackles (54 solo), tied for first with three picks and added eight passes defended and two special teams stops.

• Adebo fought off injuries in 2022 and played in 13 games with 12 starts to lead the team’s corners with 60 tackles (51 solo) and added seven passes defended for the NFL’s second-ranked club in opponent passing yards per game.
