## NEW ORLEANS SAINTS (5-9) AT GREEN BAY PACKERS (10-4)

### THE MATCHUP

The New Orleans Saints (5-9) will go on the road for their second Monday Night Football contest of the season, playing the Green Bay Packers (10-4) at Lambeau Field. Kickoff is scheduled for 7:15 p.m. CT on Monday, December 23. The contest will be nationally televised on ABC and ESPN.

Monday night will mark the fourth game between the Saints and Packers in a five-year span and this is the third straight year the Saints have visited Green Bay in either the preseason (2022) or regular season (2023-24). The Packers lead the all-time series, 18-10.

On Sunday, the Saints hosted the Washington Commanders at the Caesars Superdome and lost by a final score of 20-19, following a valiant comeback. After the Commanders led 17-0 through the middle of the third quarter, the Saints went to work and chipped away at the deficit, with offense, defense and special teams all contributing.

With New Orleans trailing 14-0 in the third quarter with the Commanders in a third-and-one situation at the Saints one-yard line, DE **Cameron Jordan** sacked QB **Jayden Daniels** for a four-yard loss to force a 23-yard field goal. In his most productive contest of the season, Jordan finished with two takedowns, setting a new franchise mark with the 28th multi-sack game of his 14-year career.

Saints QB **Spencer Rattler** then entered the game in place of **Jake Haener** and engineered a six-play, 73-yard drive that ended with a 21-yard touchdown connection between WR **Cedrick Wilson Jr.** and RB **Alvin Kamara** to put the Saints on the scoreboard for the first time.

When the Commanders got the ball back, they suffered two tackles for a loss at the hands of LB **Demario Davis** and one sack from DE **Chase Young** to force a field goal.

Rattler then went to work on the 20-7 deficit engineering a pair of field goal drives despite the loss of Kamara to a groin injury.

When the Commanders got the ball back for the final time in the contest, New Orleans used a bend but don't break philosophy on defense that avoided big plays and eventually forced a field goal attempt from the 36-yard line that went wide right.

Rattler then drove the Saints down the field 56 yards on 11 plays in the final 1:55. RB **Kendre Miller** gained 28 yards on the ground, while Rattler, completed six passes, including a one-yard touchdown to TE **Foster Moreau**, with the Black and Gold finally falling short on a two-point conversion attempt.

## THE HEAD COACHES



In his 32nd year of coaching, his 16th in the National Football League and sixth with the Saints, Darren Rizzi was named interim head coach of the New Orleans Saints on November 4, 2024. Rizzi has coordinated highly successful special teams units for the Miami Dolphins [2010-18] and Saints [2019-present]. He also added assistant head coach responsibilities in 2022 in New Orleans and also had associate head coach duties in Miami from 2017-18.

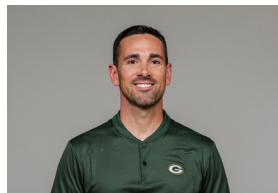
Rizzi's units have ranked in the top half of NFL writer Rick Gosselin's annual special teams rankings in 12 of the 13 full years that he has served as a coordinator, including first in 2019, fifth in both 2020 and 2021 and second in 2023. Since he entered the NFL coaching ranks in 2009, seven special teams players have been named to eight Pro Bowls under his tutelage. Rizzi has also coached six players to the NFL All-Rookie team in the past ten years.

Over his Saints coaching career, Rizzi's work on special teams have made the kicking game an integral part of New Orleans' success since 2019. Over that period, J.T. Gray's 81 tackles over that period rank first in the NFL. The punting game has produced the top three seasons in club history for punts inside-the-20-yard line. Since 2019, the Saints have excelled in the return game. Over the five-and-a-half season period, the team ranks seventh in the NFL in punt return average [10.3] and second in punt return touchdowns [3]. The coverage units have allowed the third-lowest punt return average [7.1].

Last season, New Orleans finished in the Top 10 in the NFL in 13-of-22 special teams categories, leading or sharing the lead in five of them and finishing second in two others.

A native of Hillsdale, N.J. and graduate of Bergen Catholic High School, Rizzi played tight end at Rhode Island, where he first walked on in 1988. He went on to tally 160 receptions for 2,426 yards [15.2 avg.] and 15 touchdowns in his collegiate career and was a consensus All-American in 1992, earning a degree in speech communications.

Rizzi and his wife, Tracey, have two daughters and three sons.



Named the 15th head coach in team history on Jan. 8, 2019, Matt LaFleur is entering his sixth season as Green Bay's head coach.

Through the end of the 2023 season, LaFleur led the Packers to 56 regular-season wins, tied for the second most in NFL history by a coach in his first five seasons [George Seifert, 62 from 1989-93]. In 2019-21, he became the first coach in league history to win 13-plus games in three straight seasons. He has guided the Packers to four playoff appearances in his first five years, tied for the most in the NFC since 2019, including back-to-back appearances in the NFC title game [2019-20] and the top seed in the NFC in 2020 and 2021.

LaFleur has led Green Bay over that period to a 32-9 regular-season record at home [.780], No. 1 in the NFL since 2019. In 2020, he helped the Packers rank No. 1 in the NFL in scoring [509], TDs [66] and giveaways [franchise-record 11]. He led Green Bay to a 13-3 record in his first season in '19, the biggest one-year improvement in team history [plus-seven].

LaFleur served as an offensive coordinator for two seasons [Los Angeles Rams, 2017; Tennessee Titans, 2018] and coached quarterbacks for two seasons with the Atlanta Falcons [2015-16] and four seasons with the Washington Redskins [2010-13]. Got his start in the NFL coaching ranks as an offensive assistant with the Houston Texans [2008-09]. LaFleur has been a part of three staffs that have helped their teams lead the NFL in scoring [2016 Falcons, 2017 Rams, 2020 Packers].

LaFleur played quarterback at Saginaw Valley State [2000-02], where he guided the Cardinals to three straight NCAA Division II playoff appearances and earned second-team All-Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference honors in all three seasons.

LaFleur began his coaching career as an offensive assistant at Saginaw Valley State in 2003, before working as a graduate assistant at Central Michigan from 2004-05. Also coached quarterbacks/wide receivers at Northern Michigan in 2006, served as the offensive coordinator at Ashland [Ohio] in 2007 and coached quarterbacks at Notre Dame in 2014.

## SERIES HISTORY

The Packers lead the all-time series, 18-10 after the Saints dropped an 18-17 decision at Lambeau Field on September 24, 2023. On the road, New Orleans played the first seven games at Milwaukee County Stadium, with one victory. In the seven trips to Lambeau Field since 1989, New Orleans has posted a 2-5 record, their last road win a 26-17 victory on November 12, 2017. New Orleans' first win in the Superdome, came against Green Bay on October 12, 1975, 20-19.

Ten of the 28 games between the Saints and Green Bay have been decided by seven points or less, five by a two points or less. Below is a view of the all-time results:

## LAST MEETING

**Green Bay Packers 18, Saints 7; September 24, 2023 @ Lambeau Field Green Bay, Wisc.** – The Packers came away with the victory after trailing 17-0 going into the fourth quarter.

The Packers completed the comeback with an eight-yard touchdown connection between second-year QB Jordan Love and WR Romeo Doubs to spoil what would have been a 3-0 start for New Orleans. Saints QB Jameis Winston, who entered the game for an injured Derek Carr early in the third quarter, advanced the Saints to the Green Bay 28-yard line with 1:10 remaining, but a 46-yard field goal attempt by K Blake Grupe went wide right.

New Orleans led 17-0 at halftime, with Carr having completed 11-of-16 passes for 96 yards with an eight-yard touchdown to TE Jimmy Graham and a 105.2 passer rating. On the first possession of the third quarter, DB Lonnie Johnson picked off Love to create further momentum. However on New Orleans' possession, Carr was sacked by Packers DE Rashan Gary, suffering a shoulder injury and was forced to leave the contest.

Winston came in to replace Carr and was 10-of-16 for 101 yards. New Orleans was also powered in the first half by a 76-yard punt return for a touchdown. LB Pete Werner led the Saints with 11 tackles (seven solo).

## DATING GAME

This week's game at the Green Bay Packers is being played on December 23. The Saints are 3-2 on December 23, having won their last two meetings on the day. The Black and Gold have played five different teams on the date, playing Green Bay for the first time. The Saints will be looking to win their third consecutive contest on the date of December 23 and improve to 3-1 on the road on the date. Here is a brief look at New Orleans' October 27 games:

**1990** - The Saints defeat the San Francisco 49ers, 13-10 at Candlestick Park to improve to 7-8 and continue an improbable run to the NFC Wild Card playoffs after starting the season 2-5, K Morten Andersen booted a 40-yard field goal with 4:43 remaining and LB Rickey Jackson recovered a fumble by San Francisco RB Dexter Carter with 47 seconds left to seal the victory.

**2001** - New Orleans' playoff hopes take a nose dive when they drop to 7-7, falling to the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, 34-21, at Raymond James Stadium.

**2007** - New Orleans sees their playoff chances fall with a 38-23 loss to the Philadelphia Eagles at the Superdome.

**2012** - In a contest that featured plenty of offensive fireworks and 1,008 total net yards between the teams, the Saints defeat Dallas, 34-31 at Cowboys Stadium in overtime. In a contest tied by Dallas in the next to last play of regulation, New Orleans forced a punt in the first drive of overtime and then QB Drew Brees conducted a seven-play, 72-yard game winning drive that advanced to the Dallas two-yard line, where K Garrett Hartley kicked a 20-yard field goal.

**2018** - The Saints clinched the NFC's number one playoff seed and tied a franchise record with their 13th regular season victory in a 31-28 victory over Pittsburgh at the Superdome, where LB Demario Davis clinched the victory with a fumble recovery at the New Orleans 35-yard line with 32 seconds left.

## 2024 GAME SUMMARIES

**WEEK 1: New Orleans Saints 47, Carolina Panthers 10; Sept. 8, 2024 @ Caesars Superdome** - The New Orleans Saints, behind three **Derek Carr** touchdown passes, the power of two rushing touchdowns and four **Blake Grupe** field goals, defeated the visiting Carolina Panthers in a convincing 47-10 performance, at the Caesars Superdome. New Orleans dominated Carolina in all three phases of the contest.

The Saints jumped out to a 30-0 lead, scored on their first nine possessions (tying a club record for scores on consecutive possessions) and held the football for 36:39 in time of possession en route to the highest scoring total and most lopsided opening day victory in team history. New Orleans won their sixth consecutive season opener, a club record and the current longest opener winning streak in the National Football League

The New Orleans defense also displayed their mettle, allowing only 193 total net yards of offense by the Panthers and held Carolina to just one of ten third downs.

The Saints defense recorded three takeaways and CB **Alontae Taylor** became the first Saints defensive back to record three sacks in a contest, but fans were excited by the debut of a new-look offense that helped the Saints control the clock with a rushing game that gained 180 yards and two touchdowns largely behind **Alvin Kamara's** 83 yards. Carr completed 19-of-23 passes (82.6 pct.) for 200 yards with three touchdown passes, zero interceptions and a 142.5 passer rating. The New Orleans defense harassed Carolina QB **Bryce Young** all day, as he completed only 13-of-30 passes for 161 yards with two interceptions and a 32.8 passer rating.

- With the victory, the Saints improved to 23-35 in season openers and extend their club-record winning streak of season openers to six straight, currently the longest streak in the NFL.
- WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed** led New Orleans with 73 receiving yards on three receptions (24.3 avg.) with one touchdown reception from 59 yards out, the longest play of the game. Including 60 punt return yards, sparked by a 47-yard runback and a 33-yard kickoff return, Shaheed finished with 163 all-purpose yards.
- 17 players made their Saints debuts: T **Taliese Fuaga**, G **Lucas Patrick**, LB **Willie Gay Jr.**, DB **Will Harris**, QB **Jake Haener**, WR **Cedrick Wilson Jr.**, CB **Kool-Aid McKinstry**, WR **Bub Means**, CB **Rico Payton**, P **Matthew Hayball**, LB **Khaleke Hudson**, LB **Anfernee Orji**, OL **Oli Udoh**, WR **Mason Tipton**, DTs **Kendal Vickers** and **Khristian Boyd** and DE **Chase Young**.

**WEEK 2: New Orleans Saints 44, Dallas Cowboys 19; Sept. 15, 2024 @ AT&T Stadium** - The Saints posted an impressive road victory at Dallas behind the powerful offensive firepower of RB **Alvin Kamara**, the arm of QB **Derek Carr**, the hands of WRs **Chris Olave** and **Rashid Shaheed** and two interceptions by the defense.

The Saints struck first on the opening drive as Carr led the offense down the field on a sequence end in the fourth quarter, Carr was intercepted on a tipped pass, but on the next play, New Orleans got the ball back on an interception by S **Tyrann Mathieu**, his second takeaway of the season. On the ensuing drive, New Orleans closed out the scoring in the contest with a 26-yard field goal by K **Blake Grupe**. Carr completed 11-of-16 passes for 243 yards with two touchdown throws and one interception, while scoring one rushing touchdown for a 125.0 passer rating. Kamara led the club in rushing with a game-high 115 yards on 20 carries with three touchdowns to go with two receptions for 65 yards, including a career-long 57-yard scoring grab on a screen pass. Shaheed led the Saints in receiving with four grabs for 96 yards with the deep touchdown, reaching the end zone in his third consecutive contest dating back to 2023.

## SAINTS AT COWBOYS (CONT.)

The Saints defense harassed Prescott, sacking him three times and forcing two interceptions. CB **Alontae Taylor** led the team with a career-high nine tackles, while CB **Paulson Adebo** had his first interception of the season and DE **Carl Granderson** picked up 1.5 sacks.

- The win marked the first time the Saints have won in Dallas since a 34-31 overtime victory on December 23, 2012.
- A stingy Saints run defense held the Cowboys to 68 yards rushing on 21 carries (3.2 avg.).
- The 91 points by New Orleans in their first two games are tied for the second-most in NFL history through the first two games of a season, behind the Saints' 93 point total in 2009.



**WEEK 3: Philadelphia Eagles 15, New Orleans Saints 12; Sept. 22, 2024 @ Caesars Superdome** - Philadelphia Eagles S **Reed Blankenship** intercepted Saints QB **Derek Carr** with 48 seconds left to preserve a 15-12 win over New Orleans in the Caesars Superdome.

The Saints had overcome an unsuccessful fourth-and-one conversion attempts and a 65-yard touchdown run by Eagles RB **Saquon Barkley** to take the lead in the fourth quarter with just over two minutes left, 12-7, with a field goal and a 13-yard touchdown connection from Carr and WR **Chris Olave**.

However, upon the Eagles getting the ball back, Philadelphia QB **Jalen Hurts** completed a pass to TE **Dallas Goedert** for a 61-yard gain and Barkley punched in a touchdown from four yards in to give Philadelphia their first lead of the afternoon. The Eagles improved to 2-1, while the Saints fell to 2-1.

Carr completed 14-of-25 passes for 142 yards with one touchdown and one interception. Olave had six receptions for 86 yards, including a 13-yard touchdown catch. RB **Alvin Kamara** rushed for 87 yards and caught three passes for 40 yards from 127 total yards from scrimmage.

DE **Carl Granderson** had 1.5 sacks and a forced fumble and DT **Bryan Bresee** tied a career-high with two takedowns. S **Tyrann Mathieu** had an interception, giving him takeaways in four straight games for the first time in his career dating back to the 2023 season finale. CB **Paulson Adebo** led the team with a career-high ten solo tackles and one pass breakup.

- The loss snapped a four-game winning streak, and a four-game home win streak.
- For the third consecutive game, the Saints scored on their first offensive possession with the Grupe field goal. It marked the first time since Weeks 17 and 18 of the 2022 season and the 2023 season opener, that the Saints scored on their opening possession in three consecutive games.
- Mathieu's interception was the 35th of his career since coming into the league in 2013. He and Minnesota's Harrison Smith are tied as the NFL's interception leaders among active players.
- Dating back to Week 17 of the 2023 season, New Orleans has won the takeaway battle in five consecutive contests.

**WEEK 4: Atlanta Falcons 26, New Orleans Saints 24; September 29, 2024 @ Mercedes-Benz Stadium** - Despite several significant injuries going into the contest and additional ones suffered by the team in-game, the Saints took the Falcons to the limit before dropping a 26-24 heartbreaker at Mercedes-Benz Stadium.

Atlanta K **Younghoe Koo**'s 58-yard field goal with two seconds left was the difference. New Orleans rebounded from a fumbled punt return for a touchdown early in the first quarter to reach the end zone on rushing touchdowns by TE **Taysom Hill** on their first two offensive possessions, his first two scores of the season, before departing with an abdomen injury.

### SAINTS AT FALCONS (CONT.)

Atlanta took the lead back in the second quarter at 17-14 on a 53-yard Koo field goal and a 44-yard **Troy Andersen** interception return for a touchdown. Koo added to the scoring with a 44-yard field goal midway through the third quarter and then **Blake Grupe** and Koo traded kicks with the Falcons taking the lead for the majority of the third and fourth quarters until QB **Derek Carr** engineered a nine-play, 42-yard drive ending with a one-yard touchdown run by RB **Alvin Kamara** with one minute left to pull ahead, 24-23. Atlanta rallied, as the Falcons gained 30 yards on a pass interference penalty to set up Koo's 58-yard kick.

**WEEK 5: Kansas City Chiefs 26, New Orleans Saints 13; October 7, 2024 @ GEHA Field at Arrowhead Stadium** - Despite missing five starters due to injuries, the Saints put forth a valiant effort in a 26-13 loss to the defending Super Bowl champion Chiefs on Monday Night Football, closing to within three points early in the fourth quarter before the Chiefs had a late ten-point scoring outburst. After falling behind 10-0, New Orleans moved to within three points midway through the second quarter when QB **Derek Carr** found WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed** for a 43-yard touchdown pass to cap a seven-play, 74-yard drive.

But after Kansas City milked the clock for a 15-play, 44-yard drive that ended with a 34-yard field goal by K **Harrison Butker**, the Chiefs forced a quick three-and-out and drove down the field for a 28-yard field goal. The two successful kicks late in the second quarter gave the Chiefs a 13-7 halftime lead.

New Orleans rallied with a 37-yard interception return by DT **Khalen Saunders** that set up a six-yard touchdown connection between Carr and TE **Foster Moreau**, but the Chiefs then ran down the field in five-plays and 68 yards, extending their lead to ten on a three-yard rushing touchdown by rookie WR **Xavier Worthy**.

**WEEK 6: Tampa Bay Buccaneers 51, New Orleans Saints 27; October 13, 2024 @ Caesars Superdome**

- With the Buccaneers evacuated to New Orleans for their practice week due to Hurricane Milton affecting Florida's gulf coast region, the Saints got caught in a storm of emotion and offensive production by Tampa Bay in a loss that dropped them to 2-4. Tampa Bay, who scored 24 unanswered points in the second half after trailing 27-24 at halftime, had 595 total yards of offense.

In the contest, QB **Spencer Rattler** made his first career NFL start in place of an injured **Derek Carr** (oblique). Rattler completed 22-of-40 passes for 243 yards with a ten-yard touchdown pass to fellow rookie wide receiver **Bub Means** and two interceptions. Rattler also utilized his feet with four carries for 27 yards.

Buccaneers QB **Baker Mayfield** overcame three second quarter interceptions to complete 24-of-36 passes for 325 yards with four touchdown passes. He was aided by a ground game that added 277 yards and two touchdowns.

Mayfield and the Buccaneers jumped out to a 17-0 first quarter lead, but New Orleans rallied back. Special teams provided a spark to put the team back into it. WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed** returned a punt 54 yards for a touchdown early in the second quarter to put the Saints within seven, the second of his young three-year career. On Tampa Bay's next possession, CB **Paulson Adebo** intercepted Mafield and K **Blake Grupe** drilled a 29-yard field goal.

Two plays after the Grupe field goal, S **Johnathan Abram** intercepted a tipped pass and returned it 30 yards to the Tampa Bay ten-yard line. Rattler then connected with fellow rookie Means for a ten-yard touchdown to put New Orleans ahead 20-17. After Tampa Bay took the lead quickly on a Mayfield touchdown pass, the Saints responded with a seven-play, 70-yard drive that ended with a four-yard rushing touchdown by RB **Alvin Kamara** to give the Saints a 27-24 halftime lead.

The two clubs traded punts on the first two possessions of the third quarter, but on New Orleans' second possession of the quarter, Tampa Bay turned up the heat on Rattler with two straight sacks on first and second down, forcing a punt. On Tampa Bay's next drive, Mayfield connected with WR **Chris Godwin** on a 55-yard touchdown to give the Buccaneers the lead for good on the afternoon.

**WEEK 7: Denver Broncos 33, New Orleans Saints 10; October 17, 2024 @ Caesars Superdome** - Difficulties on third down and a standout performance on the ground by the Broncos offense combined to give the Saints their fifth consecutive loss.

The Broncos and Saints traded punts on their first possessions. Denver scored when they got the ball back for their second possession on a 46-yard **Wil Lutz** field goal. Broncos LB **Cody Barton** then sacked Saints QB **Spencer Rattler** and forced him to fumble with the recovery by LB **Kwon Alexander**. at the Denver 45-yard line, setting up a 32-yard Lutz kick. The Saints were forced to punt on their first possession of the second quarter and Broncos QB **Bo Nix** engineered an eight-play, 86-yard drive that ended with an eight-yard touchdown run by RB **Javonte Williams** to give Denver a 13-0 lead.



Nix matched a Saints field goal on his and Denver's next possession, successfully running a two-minute drill that gave the Broncos a 16-3 halftime lead following a 52-yard Lutz field goal.

Denver broke open the contest in the third quarter, where they forced three New Orleans punts and added on a 38-yard field goal by Lutz and a five-yard rushing touchdown by Williams to take a 26-3 edge going into the final period.

The Broncos scored their final points of the evening with just over four minutes remaining in the fourth quarter when CB **Ja'Quan McMillian** sacked Rattler and forced him to fumble, with the ball recovered by Barton and returned 52 yards for a touchdown. With QB **Jake Haener** entering the contest to allow Rattler to rest a hip pointer injury, New Orleans would achieve some offensive rhythm to end the contest when Haener engineered a 11-play, 79-yard drive that ended with a 12-yard touchdown pass to WR **Cedrick Wilson Jr.**, the second-year signal-caller's first career touchdown pass and the sixth-year wideout's first scoring grab as a Saint.

**WEEK 8: Los Angeles Chargers 26, Saints 8; October 27, 2024 @ SoFi Stadium** - Los Angeles QB **Justin Herbert** threw two touchdowns and had a career-long 38-yard rush, while RB **J.K. Dobbins** rushed for 57 yards and pounded in a score to erase an early 2-0 deficit in the Saints' return to Southern California, where they held the first portion of their training camp.



The early lead for New Orleans came on an abated punt play, where LS **Josh Harris** fumbled the ball and when it was picked up by P **JK Scott**, TE **Taysom Hill** tackled him and forced him to fumble with the ball going out of the end zone for a safety. Late in the first quarter, Herbert carried for a 38-yard gain on a drive and the early Saints lead was erased by a 46-yard **Cameron Dicker** field goal on the first play of the second quarter. In the second quarter, Los Angeles embarked on a 15-play, 90-yard drive that ended with a one-yard rushing touchdown by Dobbins, which following a missed extra point, extended the lead to 9-2. New Orleans got the ball back with 1:37 left in the first half at their 30 and drove to cut the deficit to 9-5 on a 40-yard field goal by **Blake Grupe**.

The Chargers took a 16-5 lead on a 60-yard touchdown connection from Herbert to WR **Ladd McConkey**. New Orleans got the ball back and took advantage of a Chargers unnecessary roughness penalty, followed two plays later by a 14-yard completion from QB **Spencer Rattler** to WR **Chris Olave** to the Los Angeles 38-yard line. However, a holding penalty assessed to T **Trevor Penning** knocked New Orleans out of field goal range. The Saints forced a three and out, powered by a sack by DT **Khalen Saunders** and QB **Jake Haener** entered the contest in place of Rattler. Haener, then led New Orleans on eight-play drive that ended with a 43-yard field goal to put the Saints within eight.

## SAINTS AT L.A. CHARGERS (CONT.)

On the next drive that led into the fourth quarter, Herbert connected with WR **Joshua Palmer** for a 45-yard gain, that set up a 29-yard field goal. The clubs then traded punts on their next two possessions, with the Saints eventually reaching Chargers territory on a drive powered by a 28-yard connection from Haener to Olave. However New Orleans was set back by a failed 44-yard field goal attempt by Grupe. On the following possession, the Chargers drove 66 yards in nine plays and McConkey hauled in a nine-yard touchdown pass from Herbert for a 26-8 lead with 3:22 remaining.

Rattler was 12-of-24 passing for 156 yards and Haener completed nine-of-17 throws for 122 yards. Olave, caught eight passes for 107 yards in the team's first 100-yard receiving performance of the season and the ninth of his career.

Los Angeles out-gained New Orleans, 378-366. The Saints were 2-for-16 on third down conversions, while the Chargers were only 3-of-12 on third down attempts.

**WEEK 9: Carolina Panthers 23, New Orleans Saints 22; November 3, 2024 @ Bank of America Stadium** - An inspired effort on offense by RB **Alvin Kamara** was spoiled by Carolina RB **Chuba Hubbard's** game-winning 16-yard rushing touchdown with 2:18 remaining. The Saints were unable to drive within field goal range on their final possession. After two first quarter Saints field goals, the Panthers had staked a 7-6 lead midway through the second quarter with a three-yard touchdown connection from QB **Bryce Young** to rookie WR **Xavier Legette**.

New Orleans took the lead back on a seven-yard touchdown run by TE **Taysom Hill**, but Carolina moved back to within three with a 48-yard kick by K **Eddie Pineiro** with 38 seconds left in the first half. Coming out of halftime, the Panthers chewed up 5:05 off the clock on a nine-play, 86-yard drive that ended with a one-yard rushing touchdown by Hubbard. New Orleans answered and moved to within one point on a 51-yard field goal by **Blake Grupe** and then the defense forcing a three-and-out.

In a drive that ran into the fourth quarter, New Orleans capitalized on the three-and out with starting field position at the 30-yard line and with Kamara accounting for 40 yards from scrimmage on the drive, QB **Derek Carr** found TE **Foster Moreau** for a 17-yard touchdown.

The clubs traded jabs for the rest of the game, starting with an acrobatic interception by Saints CB **Shemar Jean-Charles** making his first career pick in his first game started.

On the ensuing drive, New Orleans was plagued by two holding penalties that set them back at their 18-yard line. The Saints got back to their 46-yard line, but were forced to punt. New Orleans again forced a three-and-out, but a face mask penalty assessed to T **Trevor Penning** on their first play from scrimmage on the drive set them back at their 13-yard line and eventually forced a punt.

After two deep pass attempts by Young that went incomplete, the second-year passer connected with Legette for a 26-yard gain on third-and-ten to the New Orleans 38-yard line. On the next play, Saints LB **Demario Davis** was assessed a 22-yard pass interference penalty, setting up the 16-yard go-ahead run by Hubbard. On the two-point attempt, Young was sacked by Saints DE **Chase Young**.

Starting at their 20-yard line, New Orleans got off to a promising start by collecting 20 yards between a four-yard carry by Kamara and a 16-yard completion from Carr to TE **Juwan Johnson**. But a sack for a six-yard loss by Panthers DT **Charles Harris** set New Orleans back to third-and-16. However after Kamara gained back 12 yards on a screen, WR **Cedrick Wilson** was unable to grasp a pass intended for him near the sideline and the Panthers would prevail for their second victory of the season.

## SAINTS AT CAROLINA (CONT.)

- Kamara tied his career-high with 155 yards rushing, 12 yards short of the franchise career rushing yardage record. It was his tenth-career 100-yard rushing performance. He had a career-best 215 total yards from scrimmage, the highest total in the NFL this season and the fifth-highest single-game total in Saints history.
- Hill's seven-yard rushing touchdown was the 41st total score of his career, putting him a tie for ninth place in club record books with RB Pierre Thomas.

**WEEK 10: New Orleans Saints 20, Atlanta Falcons 17; November 10, 2024 @ Caesars Superdome** - New Orleans broke a seven-game losing streak, holding on to defeat their division rivals as **Darren Rizzi** was successful in his debut as interim head coach.

New Orleans was led by an efficient and explosive performance through the air from **Derek Carr**, who completed 16-of-25 passes (64.0 pct.) for 269 yards with two touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 126.9 passer rating. Carr and WR **Marquez Valdes-Scantling** connected on two touchdowns.

Seeing his first significant action for the Black and Gold, Valdes-Scantling caught three passes for 109 yards (36.3 avg.). RB **Alvin Kamara** finished with 109 yards from scrimmage as he became the franchise's all-time rushing leader.

The New Orleans defense held the Falcons scoreless on four drives in the fourth quarter to allow Saints to maintain their lead. Three crucial fourth quarter splash plays took place. DE **Cameron Jordan** dropped QB **Kirk Cousins** to force a field goal attempt that was missed, S **Tyrann Mathieu** picked off Cousins in Saints territory and DE **Chase Young** dumped the signal-caller for a significant loss on a sack/forced fumble to preserve the victory.

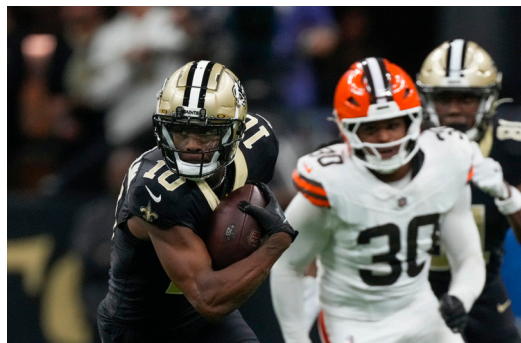


Special teams also played an important role in the victory. DT **John Rideway III** blocked a 35-yard field goal attempt near the end of the second quarter, K **Blake Grupe** drilled both of his field goal attempts and P **Matthew Hayball** dropped four punts inside-the 20-yard line.

**WEEK 11: New Orleans Saints 35, Cleveland Browns 14; November 17, 2024 @ Caesars Superdome** - New Orleans won their second straight game after snapping a seven-contest losing streak the week before.

TE **Taysom Hill** enjoyed a standout performance as the Saints rushed for a season-high 214 yards. Hill captured NFC Offensive Player of the Week honors as he rushed seven times for a career-high 138 yards (career-high 19.7 avg.) and tied his career-high with three rushing touchdowns. Hill also had a significant impact in the passing game, as he caught a career-high eight passes for 50 yards and completed a pass for an 18-yard gain. On special teams, he returned a kickoff for 42 yards.

QB **Derek Carr** continued to be a model of efficiency since his return to health from an oblique injury, when he completed 21-of-27 passes (77.8 pct.) for 248 yards with touchdown passes to TE **Juwan Johnson** and WR **Marquez Valdes-Scantling** and a 129.6 passer rating. Valdes-Scantling continued his success in stretching the field since his Week Eight acquisition and expansion of his role, catching two passes for 87 yards, including a 71-yard scoring grab, aided by a key block by Johnson. Johnson finished with three receptions for 30 yards, including the fourth quarter, one-yard scoring grab. RB **Alvin Kamara** finished with 89 total yards from scrimmage.

## CLEVELAND VS. NEW ORLEANS (CONT.)

The New Orleans defense held an opponent to under 20 points for the second consecutive week, led by a front seven that provided three sacks on the pass rush and held the Browns to only 66 yards rushing on 20 carries (3.6 avg.).

LB **Demario Davis** finished with a season-high 13 tackles and two passes defended. DE **Carl Granderson** finished with four tackles, including two stops for loss and one sack. DT **Bryan Bresee** finished with 1.5 quarterback takedowns to increase his team-leading total to a career-high 5.5.

Special teams, the forte of Interim Head Coach **Darren Rizzi**, also held their own in the contest. WR **Dante Pettis** took over punt return duties and had a career-long to 53-yard return. All three of P **Matthew Hayball's** punts dropped inside-the-20-yard line. Second-year LB **Anfernee Orji** finished with two coverage tackles.

**WEEK 13: Los Angeles Rams 21, New Orleans Saints 14; December 1, 2024 @ Caesars Superdome** - With the opportunity to further close the gap in the NFC South division race on the line and a 6-0 first half lead, the Rams outscored the Saints 21-8 in the second half to walk away with a 21-14 win. The defeat dropped New Orleans to 4-8.

After the Rams deferred after winning the coin toss, the Saints drove 34 yards on 12 plays to set up a 54-yard field goal by K **Blake Grupe**. New Orleans then forced a three-and-out, getting the ball back at their 25-yard line following a punt. The Black and Gold responded with a productive drive to the Rams 18-yard line, however a 36-yard field goal attempt by Grupe went wide left. The Rams advanced all the way to Saints 25-yard line on the ensuing possession, but Los Angeles QB **Matthew Stafford** overthrew WR **Cooper Kupp** on fourth-and-four. The clubs then traded punts and on the last drive of the half, Saints QB **Derek Carr** moved New Orleans to the 36 again, where Grupe successfully knocked down his second 54-yard kick.

Los Angeles surged ahead on the first possession of the second half with a 11-play, 70-yard drive that chewed up 6:50. RB **Kyren Williams** punched in the touchdown on a four-yard run. The teams then traded punts and the Saints were stopped midfield on their last possession of the third quarter.

After S **Tyrann Mathieu** was forced to exit on the previous play, a 46-yard connection from Stafford to Rams WR **Demarcus Robinson** on the final play of third quarter, set up a three-yard touchdown between the duo to give the Rams a 14-6 edge.

Carr went to work on a six-play, 70-yard drive that ended with a 28-yard touchdown pass to WR **Marquez Valdez-Scantling**, followed by wideout **Dante Pettis** snaring a successful two-point conversion to tie the score at 14-14.

On special teams, Rams KR **Jordan Whittington** then returned a kickoff for 43 yards to the Los Angeles 44-yard line. Stafford then completed a 20-yard pass play to Rams WR **Tutu Atwell** to put them in Saints territory. A 13-yard pass interference penalty, helped set up a seven-yard touchdown from Stafford to Rams WR **Puca Nakua** to give Los Angeles the 21-14 lead.

Determined not to give the ball back to the Rams, Carr led a methodical drive with two third down conversions and a gutsy fourth down conversion by TE **Taysom Hill** on a play where he suffered a season-ending knee injury. New Orleans advanced to the red zone on a nine-yard scramble on third and one by Carr, but were stopped on four straight plays to allow the Rams to come away with the victory in a hard-nosed contest between two old NFC West rivals.

**WEEK 14: New Orleans Saints 14, New York Giants 11; December 8, 2024 @ MetLife Stadium** - Late in the first quarter, QB **Derek Carr** took the Saints 98 yards in nine plays, capping the drive, when RB **Kendre Miller** powered through for an eight-yard rouch-down.

On New York's first drive in the second quarter, the Giants reached the Saints 19-yard line, but DT **Bryan Bresee** kicked them out of the red zone with a sack, forcing a 43-yard field goal.

## LOS ANGELES RAMS VS. NEW ORLEANS (CONT.)

The Saints moved ahead by 11 points late in the third quarter, when a 32-yard Carr-to-tight end **Foster Moreau** pass set up a 11-yard touchdown from Carr to tight end **Juwan Johnson**. The Giants move to within 11 points with 4:11 in the fourth quarter on a one-yard touchdown run by RB **Tyrone Tracy Jr.**, followed by a successful two-point conversion reception by WR **Malik Nabors**. After a three-and-out, where Carr was forced to depart the game with a concussion and hand injury, the Saints defense made a big play when LB **Demario Davis** picked off Giants QB **Drew Lock**. New York would get the ball back one more time advanced into the red zone on a 25-yard carry by Lock and a 23-yard completion to Nabors, but New Orleans held on when Bresee blocked a 35-yard field goal attempt by Giants K **Graham Gano** with 11 seconds remaining.

**WEEK 15: Washington Commanders 20, New Orleans Saints 19; December 15, 2024 @ Caesars Superdome** - The Saints hosted the Washington Commanders at the Caesars Superdome and lost by a final score of 20-19, following a valiant comeback. After the Commanders led 17-0 through the middle of the third quarter, the Saints went to work and chipped away at the deficit, with offense, defense and special teams all contributing.

With New Orleans trailing 14-0 in the third quarter with the Commanders in a third-and-one situation at the Saints one-yard line, DE **Cameron Jordan** sacked QB **Jayden Daniels** for a four-yard loss to force a 23-yard field goal. In his most productive contest of the season, Jordan finished with two takedowns, setting a new franchise mark with the 28th multi-sack game of his 14-year career.

Saints QB **Spencer Rattler** then entered the game in place of **Jake Haener** and engineered a six-play, 73-yard drive that ended with a 21-yard touchdown connection between WR **Cedrick Wilson Jr.** and RB **Alvin Kamara** to put the Saints on the scoreboard for the first time.

When the Commanders got the ball back, they suffered two tackles for a loss at the hands of LB **Demario Davis** and one sack from DE **Chase Young** to force a field goal.

Rattler then went to work on the 20-7 deficit engineering a pair of field goal drives despite the loss of Kamara to a groin injury.

When the Commanders got the ball back for the final time in the contest, New Orleans used a bend but don't break philosophy on defense that avoided big plays and eventually forced a field goal attempt from the 36-yard line that went wide right.

Rattler then drove the Saints down the field 56 yards on 11 plays in the final 1:55. RB **Kendre Miller** gained 28 yards on the ground, while Rattler, completed six passes, including a one-yard touchdown to TE **Foster Moreau**, with the Black and Gold finally falling short on a two-point conversion attempt.

Spearheaded a standout Saints offensive effort in a 35-14 victory over the Cleveland Browns on Nov. 17, where he carried seven times for career-high 138 yards (team record 19.7 avg.) with a career-high-tying three touchdowns, including a career-long 75-yard rush that ended in the end zone late in the fourth quarter. Hill also caught a career-high and club-best eight passes for 50 yards, completed a pass for a 18-yard gain and returned a kickoff 42 yards to finish with 188 total scrimmage yards and 230 all-purpose yards, both career-highs.

## TEAM NOTES

**EVANS INDUCTED INTO SAINTS RING OF HONOR ON NOVEMBER 17 AND FORMER STANDOUT SELECTED AS SEMIFINALIST FOR PRO FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME'S CLASS OF 2025.**

Former New Orleans Saints guard Jahri Evans was inducted into the club's Ring of Honor during a half-time ceremony of the November 17 win over the Cleveland Browns.

Evans, 6-4, 318, was originally a fourth round draft pick (108th overall) of the Saints in 2006 out of Bloomsburg and developed into an anchor for one of the most dominant offenses in NFL history during his tenure with the Saints. The Philadelphia, Pa. native started all 169 regular season games he played in at right guard and all of the team's ten post-season contests during that period, including all three during the 2009 campaign when the Saints captured Super Bowl XLIV.

## TEAM NOTES

A five-time Associated Press All-Pro (2009-13), Evans was selected first-team four times, twice as much as any other Saint. Evans was selected to six straight Pro Bowls (2009-14) and was named to the Pro Football Hall of Fame's 2010's All-Decade Team. During his 11-year tenure, the Saints were ranked first in the NFL in total offense (net yards per game) six times (2006, 2008-09, 2011, 2014 and 2016) and in scoring (points per game) twice (2008-09). The 274 sacks surrendered by the Saints offensive line from 2006-16 were the lowest total in the NFL over the period and the unit was recognized twice (2009 and 2011) as the winner of the Madden Pro-protector Offensive Line Award.

Evans closed out his playing career starting 14 games at right guard for the Green Bay Packers in 2017, finishing with 183 total games played/started. A Pro Football Hall of Fame semifinalist in 2023, finalist in 2024 and has reached the semifinalist round for the Class of 2025 process, Evans began his coaching career as an offensive assistant for the Saints in 2023.

Gary Kubiak was head coach of the Houston Texans from 2006-13 and the Denver Broncos from 2015-16, including the Super Bowl 50 champions. Brother Klay, serves as the 49ers passing game specialist. Brother Klein works in the Dallas Cowboys player personnel department.

**Senior Vice President/Asst. General Manager-College Personnel Jeff Ireland** - Stepson of Chiefs Hall of Fame linebacker/center E.J. Holub. Grandson of Philadelphia Eagles running back and Chicago Bears personnel executive Jim Parmer.

**National Scout Terry Wooden** - Brother, JoJo is Senior Director of Player Personnel for the Las Vegas Raiders.

**Quarterback Derek Carr** - Older brother, David was the No. 1 overall pick in the 2002 NFL Draft by the Houston Texans and played quarterback in the league for 11 seasons with Houston, Carolina, the New York Giants and San Francisco. Uncle, Lon Boyett, played tight end for Tampa Bay, the Raiders and San Francisco.

**Linebacker Demario Davis** - Cousin of the late Steve McNair, the standout quarterback for the Tennessee Titans [1995-2005] and Baltimore Ravens [2006-07].

**Tight End Taysom Hill** - Brother-in-law, David Nixon, played linebacker and on special teams for the Oakland Raiders [2009], Houston Texans [2010] and St. Louis Rams [2010-11].

**Tight End Juwan Johnson** - Brother, George, played defensive end for eight years in the NFL with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, Minnesota Vikings, Detroit Lions and Saints.

**Defensive End Cameron Jordan** - Father, Steve, had a prolific 13-year career at tight end for the Minnesota Vikings, with six Pro Bowl selections, being inducted into their Ring of Honor.

**Center/guard Erik McCoy** - Cousin of former Dolphins and Buccaneers running back Jorvorski Lane.

**Linebacker Nephi Sewell** - One brother Penei, is a member of the Detroit Lions after getting selected seventh overall in the 2021 NFL Draft. Another brother, Noah, was selected by the Chicago Bears in the fifth round of the 2023 NFL Draft.

**Area Scout Matt Phillips** - Father, Ted Phillips, worked in the Chicago Bears front office from 1983-2022, including serving his last 24 years as team president.

New Orleans Saints players [53-man player roster] come from 21 states, one from Ontario, Canada and one from Australia. Of the players on the team's roster, California [QB Derek Carr, DEs Isaiah Foskey and Carl Granderson, QB Jake Haener, DB Jordan Howden, RB Jordan Mims, WR Dante Pettis, FB Adam Prentice and RB Jamaal Williams] claims the most with eight.

### ROSTER ROLL CALL

On the Saints 53-man roster as of Dec. 10, 32 were on the active roster, a reserve list of the practice squad at the end of the 2023 season. Among newcomers, the roster includes nine unrestricted free agents, three veteran free agents, one trade acquisition, six draft picks and three rookie free agents.

Of the players, 23 have less than four years of previous NFL experience, including nine rookies. The following is a breakdown of New Orleans' roster by years of experience (year entering): 14 years - 1, 13 years - 1, 12 years - 1, 11 years - 1, 8 years - 6, 7 years - 5, 6 years - 7, 5 years - 5, 4 years - 5, 3 years - 3, 2 years - 6, 1 year - 3, rookies - 9.

### HIGHER EDUCATION

40 colleges and universities are represented on the Saints' 53-man roster. Of that total, 11 are represented by multiple Saints, three from Oregon, Notre Dame and Fresno State and two from Ohio State, Mississippi State, LSU, Notre Dame, Tennessee, Northern Iowa, South Carolina and Vanderbilt.

### POINTS PER GAME

The Saints' 91 points through Week Two were tied for the second-most points by a team with the 1971 Dallas Cowboys through the first two games of a season since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger and behind the 2009 Saints [93].

## SAINTS AT PACKERS

### BUCKING THE ODDS

The Saints have a long tradition of finding players as free agents signed after the draft that make an impact immediately or after developing their careers initially on the practice squad. Several undrafted Saints on the roster play key roles on offense, defense and special teams, including five undrafted rookies who are on the 53-man roster.

Over the past 21 years, the Saints [2018-22: DB **J.T. Gray**, WR/RS **Deonte Harty** and WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed**] and San Diego/Los Angeles Chargers [2003: G **Kris Dielman**, TE **Antonio Gates** and WR **Kasim Osgood**] are the only two teams to have three players signed as undrafted free agents be selected to a Pro Bowl for the team that originally signed them.

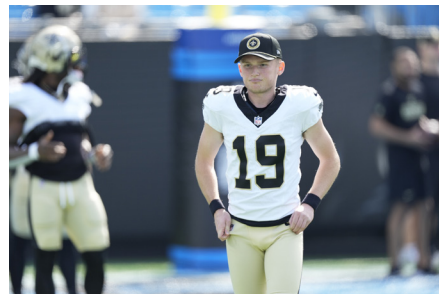
Originally signed as an undrafted free agent in 2018, spending part of his rookie season on the practice squad, Gray's 87 special teams tackles since 2019 rank first in the NFL, as he has been selected as both an AP first-team All-Pro and Pro Bowler. In 2023, the special teams captain finished the season with 11 coverage stops to lead the team and tie for 12th in the league, despite missing three contests with injuries. In 2024, he is ranked first on the team with a career-high 23 stops as the first Saint to reach 20 tackles since the 2007 campaign (CB Usama Young) and had a blocked punt on Sept. 22 vs. Philadelphia, adding three defensive tackles and one forced fumble.

DE **Carl Granderson** joined the club in 2019 as an undrafted free agent out of Wyoming and has appeared in 85 regular season games with 38 starts, posting 229 tackles [135 solo], 28.5 sacks for a loss of 183 yards, five passes defensed, four forced fumbles and two recoveries. In 2023, Granderson earned the starting right end position and posted a career-high 78 tackles [44 solo], led the team with a career-best 8.5 sacks for a loss of 55 yards, defensed one pass and forced a fumble and recovered one.

Granderson's 78 stops ranked fifth in the National Football League among defensive linemen and were the most by a Saints lineman since 2004. He has opened all 14 games in 2024 and has recorded 50 tackles [32 solo], 5.5 sacks, eight stops for loss, three passes defensed and one forced fumble.



Joining New Orleans following the 2023 NFL Draft, after a graduate transfer season at Notre Dame and playing the first four years of his college career at Arkansas State, K **Blake Grupe** won a pre-season competition to handle placekicking duties and in two seasons, has drilled 52-of-63 field goal attempts [82.5 pct.], including 22-of-26 kicks [84.6 pct.] in 2024 with a career-long of 57 yards in the season-opening win over Carolina. Dating back to the Dec. 17, 2023 win over the New York Giants until a fourth quarter miss on Oct. 27 at the Los Angeles Chargers, Grupe had made 19 consecutive field goals, the longest streak of his career and tied for sixth-longest in franchise history. With two 54-yard kicks on Dec. 1 vs. the Los Angeles Rams, Grupe has drilled 2 50+ yard kicks through the uprights in two contests in 2024.



New Orleans signed P **Matthew Hayball** out of Vanderbilt following the NFL Draft. The West Adelaide, Australia native finished as Vandy's all-time leader in punting average [46.5] and was a consensus second-team All-American in 2023, when he ranked seventh nationally in net [43.1]. Hayball won a training camp competition to secure the job. In ten games, he has punted 61 times with a 40.0 net punting average, with his club-record 33 inside the 20-yard line ranked third in the NFL.

TE **Dallin Holker** was signed by New Orleans after a standout graduate transfer campaign at Colorado State, where he posted 64 receptions for 767 yards with six TDs, the highest total of yardage and scoring grabs in the college regular season by an FBS tight end. Holker’s performance in the offseason and training camp has secured a roster spot behind Juwan Johnson and Foster Moreau. Holker has played in eight games with one start and recorded one coverage tackle. He has his first career catch on Dec. 1 at the New York Giants, a ten-yard grab.

TE **Juwan Johnson** first led Saints tight ends with four touchdown receptions in 2021, converting to the position that offseason after playing wideout in college and as a rookie in 2020, signed as an undrafted free agent from Oregon. In 2022, he led the Black and Gold tight ends in receiving with 42 grabs for 508 yards with a club-best and career-high seven touchdowns, tied for third at the position in the NFL. Johnson led the tight ends with 37 grabs for 368 yards with four touchdown grabs in 2023. Johnson has led the Saints with 14 receiving touchdowns over the past three seasons, ranked seventh over that period among league NFL tight ends.

In 2024, Johnson quickly recovered from foot surgery in June and has played in all 14 games, recording 36 receptions for 375 yards with three touchdowns, combining with Moreau to form an effective tight end duo.

After originally signing as an undrafted free agent out of Vanderbilt in 2023, where he led the Commodores in tackles in each of his final three college seasons, LB **Anfernee Orji** received the opportunity to see extensive snaps in the preseason due to injuries to teammates Demario Davis and Pete Werner. He ranks second on the team with 14 coverage stops and has also added 15 defensive tackles. [nine solo].

CB **Rico Payton** signed a college free agent contract in April, playing his final four years at Pittsburg State. In 2023, the St. Louis native recorded 35 tackles with four interceptions and 15 passes defensed. Payton secured a roster spot with his performance in the preseason, leading the team with five passes defensed and adding seven defensive tackles and one coverage stop in three contests. Payton has contributed on both defense and special teams in 13 games with one pass breakup and 11 coverage stops.

WR **Mason Tipton** stuck on the 53-man roster after showing bright spots in preseason practices and games, following a college career at Yale, where he posted 132 receptions for 1,067 yards with 19 touchdowns. In 2024, he has 14 receptions for 99 yards.

After originally signing with New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Utah in 2022, LB **Nephi Sewell** has become a valued member of the special teams units. In his first full season in 2023 on the active roster, Sewell totaled five coverage stops and one forced fumble on special teams and ten defensive tackles. Sewell spent the first ten weeks Reserve/PUP, recovering from a knee injury suffered in Week 17 of 2023, but returned to action in the Week 11 victory over Cleveland. After being voted by his Saints teammates as the team winner of the Ed Block Courage award, recognizing his rehabilitation, Sewell recorded his first coverage tackle of the season on Dec. 1, vs. the Los Angeles Rams.

**6** - In his Nov. 17 standout performance vs. Cleveland, TE Taysom Hill set career-bests in rushing yards [138], rushing average [19.7], total yards from scrimmage [188], all-purpose-yards [230] and tied career-highs in rushing touchdowns and total touchdowns [3], earning him NFC Offensive Player of the Week.

**6** - In the Sept. 15 44-19 win at Dallas, New Orleans scored touchdowns on their first six offensive possessions for only the second time in franchise history, the other occurring on Dec. 21, 2008 at Detroit. The Saints have won a franchise-record six consecutive season openers dating back to 2019. The six-game opener winning streak is the longest current streak in the National Football League.

**8** - Ring of Honor members, including guard Jahri Evans, who was inducted at halftime on Nov. 17, vs. Cleveland. Also the number of consecutive seasons LB Demario Davis has had 100 tackles in a season, including 2024, seven straight as a Saint.

**9** - In the Sept. 8 opening win over Carolina, New Orleans scored on nine straight possessions, their first nine of the contest, tying the club record previously set in 2011 and 2018. Also the number of rookies on the 53-man roster, including five draft picks [T Taliese Fuaga, CB Kool-Aid McKinstry, DT Christian Boyd, LB Jaylan Ford, and QB Spencer Rattler] and four free agents [P Matthew Hayball, TE Dallin Holker, CB Rico Payton and WR Mason Tipton].

**10** - With his second quarter two-yard touchdown reception from QB Derek Carr on Nov. 5, 2023, vs. Chicago, Hill became the first player since QB/HB Frank Gifford to have at least ten career rushing touchdowns, ten career passing touchdowns and ten career receiving touchdowns. The Saints are ranked tenth in the NFL in rushing yards per game [128.7].

**19** - Before a fourth quarter miss on Oct. 27, at the L.A. Chargers, second-year kicker Blake Grupe made consecutive field goal attempts dating back to the 2023 season, tied for the sixth-longest streak in franchise history.

**18** - Number of interceptions by New Orleans in 2023, tied for third in the NFL, more than doubling and nearly tripling their 2022 total of seven. The Saints' 13 interceptions in 2024 through 14 games are tied for eighth in the National Football league.

**28** - Number of teams DE Cameron Jordan has a sack against. The clubs Jordan has not recorded a takedown against are Baltimore, Kansas City, and the New York Jets. Also the club-record number multi-sack games.

**223** - Number of regular season appearances by Jordan, second in club history, Jordan will appear in his 224th career game on Sunday, moving into a tie for 15th in NFL history among defensive linemen with Ed [Too Tall] Jones, Jerry Hughes [Note-Hughes and the Houston Texans play Saturday], Carl Hairston and Kevin Carter.

**257** - Number of career touchdown passes by Carr, ranked 22nd in NFL record books.

## PICK CITY

## SACK ATTACK

On Sunday, vs. Washington, the New Orleans pass rush exploded for eight sacks, including two apiece by defensive ends Cameron Jordan and Chase Young. It was New Orleans' highest single game total since the 2020 season and tied for the fourth-highest in club record books. Since the November 10 contest against Atlanta, when defensive coordinator Joe Woods took over play-calling duties and Pass Rush Specialist Brian Young assumed coaching the defensive line, the Saints are tied for second in the NFL with 18 sacks. On the season, New Orleans ranks 12th in the NFL with 37 takedowns.

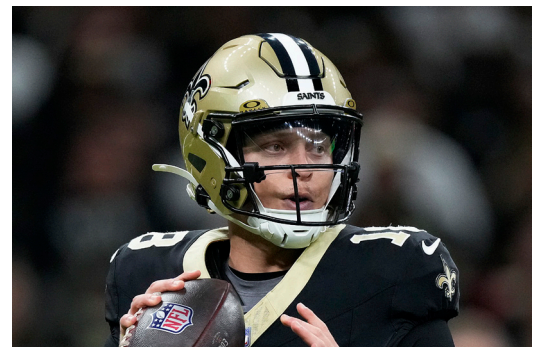
All three of the team's top three picks in the 2024 NFL Draft have started multiple games for the Saints in 2024. Below is a summary of the performance of the club's first three picks in 2024:

**T Taliese Fuaga**, Oregon State [D1] - Selected with the 14th overall pick out of Oregon State, the Saints were able to address an immediate need, while also acquiring a significant building block for the future. In Corvallis, the 6-6, 324 pound Fuaga made 25 starts at right tackle in 39 games in Corvallis, including opening all 12 contests in 2023, when he received first-team All-America honors. Fuaga has been an anchor on the Saints offensive line in his rookie campaign, seamlessly moving over to the left tackle position for his first NFL season, where he has opened every game for an offense that has improved in every rushing metric, while surrendering only 28 sacks, tie for the eight-lowest total in the NFL.



**CB Kool-Aid McKinstry**, Alabama [D2] - Selected in the second round of the 2024 NFL Draft with the 41st overall pick out of Alabama, McKinstry arrived in New Orleans having covered many of the nation's top wideouts in the Southeastern Conference for the last three years. In 2023, the consensus first-team All-American was a semifinalist for the Jim Thorpe Award, making 32 tackles and seven passes defended. In New Orleans, McKinstry has played in 12 games with six starts, moving into the starting lineup in Week Eight and has recorded 35 tackles and six passes defended, often tasked with covering an opponent's top wideout.

**QB Spencer Rattler**, South Carolina [D5a] - Selected with the team's first selection in the fifth round [150th overall] out of South Carolina, Rattler completed 900-of-1,313 passes [68.5 pct.] for 10,807 yards with 77 touchdowns, and only 32 interceptions for the Gamecocks [2022-23] and Oklahoma [2019-21]. As a rookie, Rattler has played in four games with three starts and completed 69-of-120 passes for 706 yards with two touchdowns, also carrying nine times for 61 yards. Inserted into Sunday's game at Washington after halftime, Rattler helped New Orleans put on a valiant rally from a 17-0 deficit to engineer two touchdown drives and two field goal drives.





## SAINTS AT PACKERS

### SUPER SPECIAL TEAMS UNITS

In their fifth year under the supervision of **Darren Rizzi**, who was elevated to interim head coach on Monday after supervising special teams since 2019, the Saints special teams units finished 2023 ranked second in the NFL under writer Rick Gosselin's comprehensive rankings system. This was the fourth top five ranking by the Saints special teams units during Rizzi's tenure, based on 22 kicking-game categories with New Orleans leading or sharing the lead in five of them and finishing in the top ten in 13.



### SPECIAL TEAMS TOUCHDOWNS

In 2023, New Orleans recorded two touchdowns on special teams for the first time since the 2017 campaign. WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed** had a 76-yard punt return for a touchdown at Green Bay on Sept. 24, the team's first punt return for a touchdown since 2019. On Dec. 10, vs. Carolina, LB **Nephi Sewell** forced Panthers P Johnny Hekker to fumble on a punt play, which was recovered by LB **D'Marco Jackson** for an eight-yard touchdown. New Orleans scored their first of 2024 on October 13, when Shaheed returned a punt 54 yards for a score vs. Tampa Bay.

### RETURN GAME

Shaheed provided a spark to the New Orleans punt return game prior to his season-ending knee injury in Week Six. He was on his way to being selected as a Pro Bowl starter as a return specialist, a first-team *Associated Press* All-Pro as a punt returner again. Shaheed is now only the third Saint with multiple punt returns for touchdowns.

With Shaheed suffering the season-ending knee injury, the punt return duties have since fallen to **Dante Pettis**. Pettis, a speedster, who was originally a second round pick of the San Francisco 49ers out of the University of Washington in 2018 and the son of former major league baseball base stealing legend, Gary Pettis, had a career-long 53-yard punt return in the second half of the team's 35-14 win over Cleveland on Nov. 17, to set up a touchdown. As a team, New Orleans is ranked sixth in the National Football League in team punt return average, one of five clubs to have a runback for a touchdown. With the 54-yard touchdown by Rashid and the 53-yard runback by Pettis, the Saints are the only team in the NFC and one of only two in the NFL in 2024 to have two punt returns of 50-or-more yards.

### BLOCK UNIT

New Orleans' field goal block unit has come through big on two occasions since Rizzi took over interim head coach duties in a pair of three point victories. In the Nov. 10, 20-17 win over Atlanta, DT **John Ridgeway III** made a game-changing play when he blocked a 35-yard field goal attempt in the next to last play of the first half.



In the Dec. 15 14-11 win at the New York Giants, DT **Bryan Bresee's** block of a 35-yard field goal attempt with 11 seconds left preserved the Saints victory and prevented the contest from going to overtime.



### COVERAGE CAPTAIN

New Orleans' coverage units in 2024 are again led by special teams co-captain **J.T. Gray**. Signed by the Saints following the 2018 NFL Draft out of Mississippi State, Gray has been voted by his teammates as a special teams captain for the past three seasons and has been selected both as a Pro Bowl starter and *Associated Press* All-Pro. Playing in 54 career games, Gray has career totals of 90 special teams stops, two blocked punts, three fumble recoveries and 13 defensive tackles, 2.5 sacks, one forced fumble and a pass defense. In 2023, he finished with 11 coverage stops to lead the team and tie for 12th in the NFL in 14 contests. Gray's special teams impact was at its best on September 22 vs. Philadelphia, when he blocked a punt in the third quarter against the Eagles, the second of his career.



Gray's 90 tackles since 2018 are ranked first in the NFL, despite missing six total contests in 2022 and 2023 with injuries. Since his first full season in 2019, Gray's 88 stops rank first in the league. In 2024, Gray is ranked first on the team with a career-high 24 coverage stops, the most by a Saint since 2007 [DB Usama Young-20], adding three tackles and one forced fumble on defense.

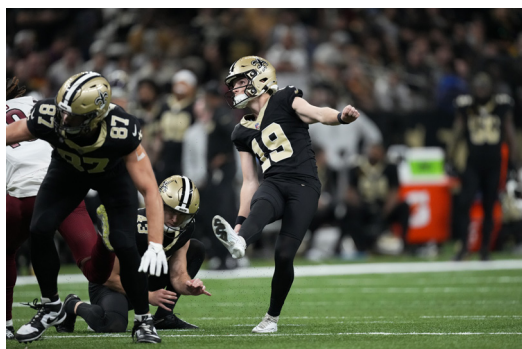

**JUST FOR KICKS**

In 2023, rookie free agent kicker **Blake Grupe** won placekicking duties in a training camp competition and has made significant contributions to the special teams units.



Grupe was signed as a free agent out of Notre Dame, where he played his graduate campaign in 2022, after handling kicking duties at Arkansas State from 2017-21. In 17 games, Grupe made 30 of 37 field goal attempts and all 40 PAT attempts to lead the team with 130 points. In 2024, Grupe has made 22-of-26 field goal attempt, including two contests this season with two 50+-yard kicks. On Oct. 27, a 19-kick streak of successful field goal attempts came to end end, tied for the sixth-longest streak in franchise history.

## QUARTERBACKS

### DEREK CARR



On March 6, 2023, the Saints agreed to terms with Derek Carr on a four-year contract to solidify the quarterback position. He spent the first nine seasons of his NFL career with the Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders. Originally selected in the second round [36th overall] of the 2014 NFL Draft by the Raiders out of Fresno State, the Bakersfield, Calif. native has started all 169 career regular season games he has played in, the most starts at the position over that time, completing 3,765-of-5,785 passes [65.1 pct.] for 41,245 yards with 257 touchdown passes, 112 interceptions and a 92.8 passer rating, while adding 956 rushing yards and seven touchdowns. Since entering the league in 2014, Carr ranks first in the NFL in completions, second in passing yardage and sixth in passing touchdowns. He became the third quarterback in NFL history to pass for 3,000-plus yards in each of his first ten seasons, joining Pro Football Hall of Fame signal-caller Peyton Manning and Russell Wilson. He is just the seventh player in NFL history to reach 40,000 passing yards in his first nine seasons and has completed 322 passes of 25+ yards since he entered the league in 2014, third-most in the NFL over that span.

Carr started all 17 games in 2023 and completed 375-of-548 passes [68.4 pct.] for 3,878 yards with 25 touchdowns, eight interceptions and a 97.7 passer rating. He finished his first season in Black and Gold ranked second in the NFL in fourth quarter passer rating [106.9], sixth in completion percentage, seventh in completions and tenth in TD passes and passer rating.

In 2024, Carr has completed 189-of-279 passes [67.7 pct.] for 2,145 yards, 15 touchdowns, only five interceptions and a 101.1 passer rating. He missed his first games as a Saint in Weeks Six-Eight [oblique], but returned to action for the team's Week nine contest at Carolina and is ranked fifth in the NFL in third down passer rating [109.6] and tenth in the NFL in passer rating.

## RUNNING BACKS

### ALVIN KAMARA

A talented runner and receiver who was selected by the Saints in the third round of the 2017 NFL Draft out of Tennessee, Kamara enjoyed an outstanding rookie campaign. He ranked first on the club and sixth in the NFL in yards from scrimmage (1,554), second on the team in rushing and receiving, carrying 120 times for 728 yards (6.1 avg) with eight TDs and a two-point conversion, catching 81 passes for 826 yards (10.2 avg) with five touchdowns and one kickoff return for a touchdown. Kamara set a club rookie record with 14 total scores, tied for second in the NFL and finished first in the league in yards per carry. Kamara was the first Saints offensive rookie selected to the Pro Bowl since Rueben Mayes (1986), as an AP second team All-Pro (flex), the club's first rookie All-Pro since 1993. He was also named *The Sporting News* NFL Rookie of the Year and AP NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year.

In 115 career regular season games with 84 starts, Kamara has carried 1,543 times for 6,779 yards (4.4 avg.) with 60 touchdowns and has caught 573 passes for 4,762 yards (8.3 avg.) with 25 touchdowns. Kamara is the franchise's all-time leader in rushing yards, rushing touchdowns, total touchdowns (86), total yards from scrimmage (11,541) and all-purpose yardage (12,199).

Kamara is enjoying a spectacular season in 2024, carrying 228 times for 950 yards (4.2 avg.) with six touchdowns and catching a club-best 68 passes for 573 yards (8.0 avg.) with two touchdowns. With the ability to move the chains in volume, he is ranked fourth in the National Football league in total yards from scrimmage (1,493), seventh in first downs (70) and ranks second running backs in receiving. With 50 rushing yards on Monday night, he will reach 1,000 for the first time in his career and be the first Saint since Mark Ingram in 2017.

In the Saints' 2020 Christmas 52-33 win over the Vikings, Kamara tied the National Football League record for total touchdowns (6) and rushing touchdowns (6), as he carried 22 times for a career-high 155 yards (7.0 avg.), adding three receptions for 17 yards for 172 yards from scrimmage. ### JAMAAL WILLIAMS

This seven-year NFL veteran was signed by the New Orleans Saints as an unrestricted free agent in the 2023 offseason. In eight NFL seasons with Green Bay [2017-20], Detroit [2021-22] and New Orleans [2023-], Williams has played in 114 games with 44 starts, carrying 1,056 times for 4,087 yards with 32 touchdowns, also catching 185 passes for 1,291 yards with eight touchdowns for 5,352 total yards from scrimmage. Williams is part of a formidable rushing duo with Kamara. In 2024, he has spelled Kamara at key times, rushing for 129 yards with one touchdown, catching seven passes for 38 yards and returning eight kickoffs for 210 yards [26.3 avg.].

### JORDAN MIMS

A former standout at Fresno State, where he rushed for 3,285 yards and 37 TDs, Mims joined the Saints practice squad after going to 2023 training camp with Buffalo and contributed on special teams in two games for the Black and Gold in 2023. 6-0, 205, Mims will contribute in the run game and on special teams after earning a roster spot and had a coverage tackle, Sept. 22, vs. Philadelphia and has rushed for 42 yards and caught four passes for 42 yards.

## WIDE RECEIVERS

### MARQUEZ VALDES-SCANTLING

A fifth round pick of the Green Bay Packers in 2018 out of South Florida, Valdes Scantling is a seven-year NFL veteran, who has played in 104 career regular season games with 66 starts for the Packers [2018-21], Kansas City Chiefs [2022-23], Buffalo Bills [2024] and Saints [2024-present]. He has posted career totals of 202 receptions for 3,533 yards [17.5 avg.] with 20 touchdowns and with his 6-4, 206-pound frame has the ability to win contested catches and make big plays. Valdes-Scantling's 17.5 yards per catch average since coming into the NFL in 2018, ranks first in the league.

## DEEP THREAT

In his second appearance with New Orleans, since signing two weeks ago, Valdes-Scantling put on one of the most impressive receiving performances of the season on Nov. 10, vs. Atlanta, grabbing three passes for 109 yards [36.3 avg.] with touchdowns of 40 yards and two years, as well as a 67-yard grab. In yards per catch [min. three receptions], Scantling's 36.3 average was the fifth-highest single game performance in the NFL in 2024. he followed that up on Nov. 17, when he turned a screen pass from Derek Carr into a 71-yard touchdown, the longest pass by the team in 2024

**CEDRICK WILSON JR.**

This seventh-year wideout was signed by New Orleans to a two-year contract at the start of free agency to compete for snaps on offense and to provide veteran leadership to the wideout room. In 80 regular season games with eight starts, he has recorded 114 receptions for 1,428 yards with 12 touchdowns. In 2023, the Memphis native posted 22 catches for 296 yards with three touchdowns, adding three grabs for 37 yards in the postseason. In 12 contests with one start in 2024, Wilson has grabbed 13 passes for 159 yards with one touchdown and contributed on special teams with eight tackles. On Sunday, vs. Washington, Wilson tossed a 21-yard touchdown to RB Alvin Kamara.

**KEVIN AUSTIN JR.**

A three-year letterman at Notre Dame, Kevin Austin Jr. played in 26 games with 13 starts and finished his college career with 54 receptions for 996 yards [18.4 avg.] with seven touchdowns. He enjoyed his most productive season as a senior in 2021, when he started all 13 games he played in and recorded 48 receptions for 888 yards [18.5 avg.] with seven touchdowns, earning first-team Phil Steele All-Independent honors.

Following his college career, the 6-2, 200-pound South Florida native spent the 2022 season on the Jacksonville Jaguars practice squad. In the spring of 2024, he had 15 receptions for 253 yards with two touchdowns for the UFL's Birmingham Stallions. Signing with New Orleans at the start of training camp, Austin started the season on the practice squad, before moving into the starting lineup in Week 11. Since then, he has played in five games with one start and recorded eight receptions for 98 yards and carried once for nine yards as he has helped a position group that has faced injuries.

**TIGHT ENDS**

**JUWAN JOHNSON**

The former Penn State and Oregon wideout joined the New Orleans Saints in 2020 following the NFL Draft and transitioned to tight end his second season in 2021. In 2022, the New Jersey native had a breakout campaign as he appeared in 16 games with 12 starts and finished with 42 receptions for 508 yards and a team-best seven touchdown grabs. Johnson was tied for third among National Football League tight ends in receiving touchdowns. Overall, Johnson's 18 touchdown grabs since 2021 lead the team.

In 13 games with 11 starts in 2023, Johnson finished with 37 receptions for 368 yards and four touchdowns to lead the position group in all major receiving categories. In his final four contests of the season, three of which were Saints victories, Johnson had 17 grabs for 206 yards and three touchdowns. In 2024, Johnson has stepped up after missing most of training camp with a foot injury to play in all 14 games with three starts and make 36 receptions for 375 yards and three touchdowns.

**FOSTER MOREAU**

This veteran tight end and New Orleans native who was a standout at Jesuit High School and Louisiana State University signed with the Saints in the 2023 offseason. He finished his fifth National Football League season and first with the Black and Gold after spending his first four campaigns with the Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders, who originally selected him in the fourth round of the 2019 NFL Draft. In his career, Moreau has contributed both as a pass catcher and blocker, appearing in 90 regular season games with 58 starts and has recorded 135 receptions for 1,602 yards [11.9 avg.] with 17 touchdowns, also adding seven special teams tackles.

In his first season with the Saints, Moreau was selected as the club's winner of the Ed Block Courage Award, recognizing his recovery and return to the field following an offseason diagnosis of Nodular Lymphocyte-Pedominant Hodgkins Lymphoma [NLPHL] at a free agency physical with the team. Moreau returned to the field following the NFL Draft and also battled a nagging ankle injury to play in 15 games with ten starts and recorded 21 receptions for 193 yards with one touchdown.

In 2024, Moreau has four scoring grabs on 23 catches for 302 yards [13.1 avg.], starting all 14 games, providing a presence pass catching as well blocking for the NFL's 11th-ranked run offense and in the passing game.



**DEFENSIVE LINE**

**CAMERON JORDAN**

New Orleans' first choice in the 2011 NFL Draft [24th overall] out of the University of California, Jordan has played in 223 career regular season games with 222 starts, recording 801 tackles [490 solo], a franchise record 120.5 sacks for a loss of 795.5 yards, three interceptions, 67 pass breakups, 15 forced fumbles and 11 fumble recoveries. In 2023, despite a lingering ankle injury, Jordan started every contest and recorded 43 tackles [20 solo], two sacks, three pass breakups and one fumble recovery.



Jordan has returned from offseason ankle surgery to start every game and ranks among the team's leaders on the defensive line, starting all 14 games and making 25 tackles, three sacks for a loss of 16 yards, including two on Sunday vs. Washington, one interception and four passes defended. Off-the-field, as a ten-time team captain, Jordan sets the standard for excellent as he was selected as the team nominee for the third time for the NFL's Walter Payton Man of the Year award and also has been recognized for his citizenship and commitment to family and community as one of ten finalists for the Bart Star Award. Jordan's leadership has served as a crucial component in a Saints season that has faced adversity in the form of extensive injuries and an in-season coaching change in the face of a seven-game losing streak. His leadership has helped set a tone for the team to rally and win three of their last five contests after a 2-7 start to the season.

## MR. 200

On Dec. 24, 2022, at Cleveland, Jordan played in his 200th career game [regular season/postseason combined] in a Black and Gold uniform, moving him into third place on the club's all-time games played list. The following week at Philadelphia, Jan. 1, 2023, Jordan also started his 200th career game, joining Drew Brees as only the second player to open 200 contests in franchise history. On Sept. 24, 2023, at Green Bay, Jordan played in his 206th career game, passing Thomas Morstead for second all-time in club record books. On Oct. 29, 2023, Jordan became only the second Saints player, first defensive Saint and 57th NFL defensive lineman to play in 200 regular season contests. On Nov. 5, 2023 vs. Chicago, he became only the second Saint to start 200 career regular season contests. Jordan has played in 223 career regular season games and playing in his 224th game on Monday night and move into a tie for 15th all-time among NFL defensive linemen.

Jordan is the only NFL defender to record at least 300 tackles, 60 sacks, 75 stops for loss and 90 quarterbacks hits since 2017. Since 2017, he has posted 408 stops, 74 sacks, 92 tackles for loss and 134 quarterback hits.

Jordan is now one of only 15 National Football League players to have at least 15 sacks against two opponents, 17 against the Tampa Bay Buccaneers and 23 against the Atlanta Falcons, both NFC South divisional rivals. 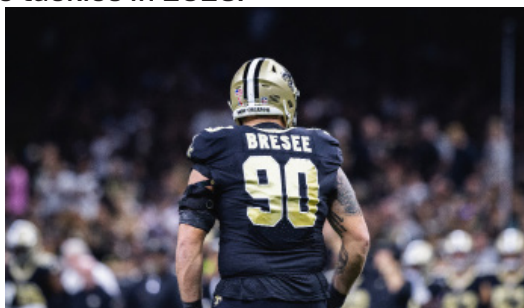

**BRYAN BRESEE**

The team’s first round selection in 2023 out of Clemson after being a three-time All-ACC selection, the Maryland native played in 26 games with 21 starts for the Tigers, producing 54 tackles [35 solo], 15 stops for loss, nine sacks, a forced fumble, an interception and five passes defensed.

Bresee immediately found a role in New Orleans’ interior rotation and appeared in all 17 games, recording 24 tackles, 4.5 sacks and six passes defensed. His takedown total was the highest by a Saints rookie defensive tackle since becoming an official statistic in 1982 and his pass defense total was the most in club records for a rookie at the position since the statistic was officially recorded in 1980. Bresee also tied for second in the league among defensive tackles in 2023.



Bresee is enjoying a breakout sophomore campaign, playing in all 14 games and ranked third in the NFL among defensive tackles with a career-high and team-leading 7.5 sacks. The 7.5 takedowns are the ninth-highest total in a single-season for a Saints defensive tackle.

**CARL GRANDERSON**

Signed by New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Wyoming in 2019, Granderson posted 17.5 sacks in college and possesses the prototypical frame for an NFL pass rusher. Granderson has become a significant cog in the team’s defensive line rotation with 229 tackles, 28.5 sacks, five pass breakups, four forced fumbles and two recoveries.

Earning the starting right defensive end position in 2023, Granderson posted a career-high 78 tackles [44 solo], led the team with a career-best 8.5 sacks for a 55-yard loss, one pass defense, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery. Through 14 games in 2024, Granderson has 50 tackles, 5.5 sacks, tied for second on the team with Chase Young, a career-high three passes defensed and one forced fumble.

**TACKLES UP FRONT**

Granderson’s 78 tackles in 2023 ranked fifth in the National Football League among defensive linemen and were the most by a Saints defensive lineman since 2004.

**PAYTON TURNER**

With the 28th overall pick in the 2021 NFL Draft out of Houston, the Saints added to the line with this gifted pass rusher. In 18 career games, Turner has recorded 29 tackles, three sacks, one pass breakup one fumble recovery, one special teams stop and one blocked field goal. In 2023, the Texan suffered a toe injury in the season-opening win over Tennessee that would sideline him for 15 contests. However, Turner returned for the season finale vs. Atlanta and recorded the first fumble recovery of his career, showing his promise both with his pass rush and playmaking abilities. Turner is a part of the team’s defensive line rotation in 2024 with 17 tackles, two sacks, a career-high four passes defensed, one forced fumble and two special teams stops.

**CHASE YOUNG**

Originally selected by Washington with the second overall pick in the 2020 NFL Draft out of Ohio State, this talented edge rusher is in his fifth season in the NFL and first with New Orleans. In five campaigns for Washington (2020-23), San Francisco (2023) and New Orleans (2024), Young has appeared in 57 regular season games with 32 starts and recorded 125 tackles (83 solo), 22 sacks, 28 stops for loss, 11 pass breakups, seven forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries. The consensus NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year, Young recorded 44 tackles, 7.5 sacks, ten stops for loss and made multiple splash plays with four forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries in 2020. Young played in only 12 games from 2021-22 after suffering a knee injury midway through his second campaign. In 2023, he played in seven games for Washington and nine for San Francisco following a midseason trade and tied his career-best with 7.5 takedowns in helping the 49ers advance to Super Bowl LVIII. Young has fit in with the New Orleans defensive line with 25 tackles, 5.5 sacks, a takedown on a two-point conversion attempt, a forced fumble and two pass defenses.

**NATHAN SHEPHERD**

Originally selected by the New York Jets in the third round of the 2018 NFL Draft out of Fort Hays State, this versatile defensive tackle enters his seventh NFL season, his second campaign with the Saints. The Ajax, Ontario, Canada native has appeared in 104 career games with 43 starts, totaling 193 tackles (98 solo) and 10.5 sacks for a loss of 75 yards. In 2024, this valued free agent acquisition has started every game for New Orleans for the second consecutive season and has 30 tackles and 1.5 sacks.

**KHALEN SAUNDERS**

Originally selected by Kansas City in the third round of the 2019 NFL Draft out of Western Illinois, Saunders enters his sixth NFL season and second campaign with New Orleans. Signed as an unrestricted free agent in 2023, Saunders combined with two other newcomers in Shepherd and Bresee to form a new interior front, recording career-highs in tackles (57) and solo stops (24). In 65 career regular season games with 29 starts, Saunders has recorded 166 tackles (75 solo), 6.5 sacks, one interception, four pass breakups and five stops for loss.

**LINEBACKERS**



**DEMARIO DAVIS**

This dependable and sure-tackling defender joined the New Orleans Saints in 2018 after spending his first six NFL seasons with the New York Jets and Cleveland Browns. In his career, the Brandon, Miss. native has appeared in 207 regular season games with 193 starts for the Jets (2012-15, 2017), Browns (2016) and the Saints (2018-), recording 1,439 stops (911 solo), 44.5 sacks, four interceptions, 60 pass breakups, four forced fumbles, eight fumble recoveries and 24 special teams tackles.

In 2023, Davis started every contest and again led the Black and Gold in tackles with 121 stops (74 solo), ranked second with 6.5 sacks and added one forced fumble, one fumble recovery and four pass breakups. He joined LB Joe Federspiel as only the second Saint to have 100 stops in six straight seasons, having done so in his last seven campaigns and his tenth season overall of his 12-year National Football League career.

Through 13 games in 2024, Davis has 104 stops (51 solo), one sack, one interception and five passes defended, despite missing the first game of his career due an injury, ranking first on the team in stops. Davis has reached 100 stops for the eighth straight season.

**PETE WERNER**

New Orleans selected this three-year starter from Ohio State in the second round of the 2021 NFL Draft. The Indianapolis native finished his college career playing in 47 career games with 35 starts, recording 185 tackles [111 solo], 16 stops for loss, four sacks, 11 pass breakups, four forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Werner helped power the Buckeyes to the College Football Playoff championship game as a senior in 2020, when he was voted by the Big Ten coaches as a first-team All-Conference selection and a Butkus Award semi-finalist, posting 54 tackles, 2.5 stops for loss, one sack and two forced fumbles.

In four seasons, Werner has played in 54 games with 46 starts and has recorded 301 tackles [196 solo], a split sack, one interception, five pass breakups, two forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and three special teams stops.

Werner finished the 2023 season ranked second on the team with 93 stops, a split sack, one interception, one pass breakup and two fumble recoveries, tied for the team lead. In ten games started/played in 2024, he has posted 70 tackles [45 solo] and one pass defense.

**WILLIE GAY JR.**

A contributor on defense for the back-to-back Super Bowl Champion Kansas City Chiefs, this sideline to sideline linebacker joined the Saints at the start of the 2024 free agency period. In five seasons, Gay has played in 70 regular season games with 55 starts, posting 250 tackles [163 solo], seven sacks, four interceptions, including one returned for a touchdown, 21 pass breakups, three forced fumbles, six fumble recoveries and eight special teams stops. In nine postseason games played/starts, Gay has accumulated 29 stops, a split sack and three passes defended.

In his final season in Kansas City, Gay played in 16 regular season games with 15 starts for the Chiefs and finished the season with 58 tackles [44 solo], one sack, one interception, four pass breakups, one forced fumble and a career-high three fumble recoveries. In three postseason starts en route to the Super Bowl Championship, Gay collected nine more stops and one pass defense. Despite missing one contest with a hand injury, Gay leads the Saints in 2024 with two fumble recoveries and has added two sacks.

**ANFERNEE ORJI**

After originally signing as an undrafted free agent out of Vanderbilt in 2023, where he led the Commodores in tackles in each of his final three seasons, Orji spent his entire rookie season on the club's practice squad. He received the opportunity to see extensive snaps in practice in training camp due to injuries to teammates Davis and Werner. In three preseason contests, Orji led the team with 20 tackles [team-high 13 solo], one stop for loss, two passes defended and three special teams stops, securing a 53-man roster spot. He ranks second on the team with 14 special teams tackles and has added 15 defensive stops.

**SECONDARY**

**S TYRANN MATHIEU**

This versatile, hard-hitting, playmaking safety and New Orleans native enters his third season with his hometown team, signing after the 2022 NFL Draft. Mathieu has brought experience and leadership to the Saints secondary. He was originally selected by the Arizona Cardinals in the third round (69th overall) in the 2013 NFL Draft out of LSU and has played for the Cardinals (2013-17), Houston Texans (2018), Kansas City Chiefs (2019-21) and Saints (2022-). In 11 NFL seasons, he has played in 177 regular season games with 168 starts and has posted career totals of 814 tackles (672 solo), 43 stops for loss, 11 sacks for a loss of 78 yards, 36 interceptions for 530 return yards, four brought back for touchdowns, 105 passes defensed, seven forced fumbles, eight fumble recoveries and five special teams stops. Mathieu has been selected to three Pro Bowls, three *Associated Press* All-Pro teams and the Pro Football Hall of Fame’s 2010’s All-Decade Team.

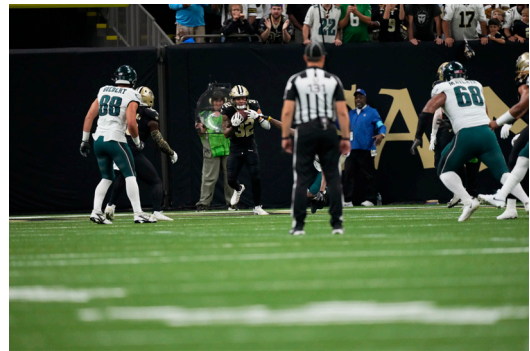
In his second season in New Orleans in 2023, Mathieu opened all 17 contests for the second consecutive campaign and finished with 75 tackles (50 solo), four interceptions, tied for seventh in the NFL and the team lead, returned for 122 yards with a TD and nine passes defensed.

**THE ONLY ONE**

In 2024, Mathieu is his usual playmaking self. Through 14 games, he has opened every contest at free safety and posted 52 tackles (38 solo), three interceptions, six pass breakups, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. Mathieu is tied for 13th in the National Football League with three interceptions and is ranked first on the club with four total takeaways.

**FOUR IN A ROW**

Dating back to an interception in the 2023 season finale vs. Atlanta, recovering a fumble in the 2024 season opener vs. Carolina and picking off Dallas Cowboys quarterback Dak Prescott and Philadelphia Eagles signal-caller Jalen Hurts in Weeks Three and Four, Mathieu recorded a least one takeaway in four consecutive games for the first time in his career. Mathieu is the first Saints defender to record takeaways in four consecutive contests since safety Sammy Knight had at least one in five consecutive contests from Oct. 7-Nov. 4, 2001.



**NOSE FOR THE BALL**

Mathieu’s 36 interceptions since coming into the NFL in 2013 are first in the league over the period after tying for the club lead with four picks in 2023 and tying for the team lead with three in 2024. Mathieu’s 36 career picks are tied with Minnesota’s Harrison Smith for the most among active players.

**ALONTAE TAYLOR**

Selected by the Saints in the second round (49th overall) of the 2022 NFL Draft out of Tennessee, Taylor shook off early injuries to play in 13 games with nine starts and posted 45 tackles (38 solo) and a club-best 11 pass breakups, ranked fourth among NFL rookies.

Moving to the nickel position in 2023, possessing extensive experience on the inside and the outside, Taylor appeared in all 17 games with 13 starts and recorded 75 tackles, his first two career interceptions and a career-high 14 pass breakups, tied for second on the team and ninth in the NFL.

In 2024, Taylor has played in all 14 games with 11 starts and ranks second on the team with 79 tackles (55 solo), is ranked third with four sacks and has added 13 passes defended and a team-best two forced fumbles. His four sacks are tied for the most by a Saints cornerback with Alex Molden. His pass defense total is tied for fifth in the National Football League.

**GET A HAND ON**

Taylor's 13 passes defended in 2024 are tied for fifth in the National Football League, while his 38 since coming into the NFL in 2022 are ranked sixth.

**DB DROP**

In the Sept. 8 season-opening win over Carolina, Taylor became the first Saints defensive back to record three sacks in a contest since the statistic was officially recognized by the NFL in 1982. The only other defensive back to record three sacks on kickoff weekend is former Chargers S Rodney Harrison (vs. Buffalo, 9/6/98). After splitting a sack on October 27 at the Los Angeles Chargers, Taylor's four sacks are tied for the highest total by a cornerback in Saints record books with Alex Molden's four in 1997, while the total leads all defensive backs.

## WASHINGTON COMMANDERS VS. NEW ORLEANS SAINTS SUNDAY, DEC. 15, 2024 • CAESARS SUPERDOME POSTGAME NOTES

- The New Orleans Saints fell to the Washington Commanders 20-19 on Sunday. With the loss, New Orleans drops to 5-9 on the season and will play the Green Bay Packers at Lambeau Field on Monday, December 23 at 7:15 p.m. CT. The game will be nationally televised on ABC and ESPN.
- The Saints rallied back from a 14-0 halftime deficit and trailed 17-0 in the third quarter before outscoring Washington 19-3 for the remainder of the game. New Orleans narrowed the deficit to 20-19 on a one-yard touchdown pass from QB **Spencer Rattler** to TE **Foster Moreau** as time in regulation expired. The Saints opted to attempt a two-point conversion for the win that did not convert.
- New Orleans has held opponents to 21 or fewer points in the five contests since Interim Head Coach **Darren Rizzi** took over.
- The Saints tallied a season-high eight sacks against the Washington Commanders. The team last did so against the Falcons on Nov. 22, 2020. All-time, New Orleans has recorded nine sacks in a contest three times and eight sacks in a contest five times since sacks were recognized as an official statistic by the NFL in 1982.
- Sunday's contest marked the fourth time since 1982 that the Saints have recorded five sacks in the first half of a contest, tying a franchise record.
- QB **Spencer Rattler** entered the game in the third quarter. On his first drive, he led the Saints down the field completing 2-of-4 passes for 51 yards in a touchdown drive that was 6 plays, 71 yards and 2:27 time of possession.
- Rattler finished the game completing 10-of-21 passes for 135 yards and had one touchdown pass for an 84.4 QBR.
- QB **Jake Haener** made his first career start, becoming the 39<sup>th</sup> different starting quarterback in franchise history. Haener, the 2023 fourth-round draft pick, completed 4-of-10 passes for 49 yards, had one interception and was sacked three times for 29 yards.
- With 1:55 left to play, Rattler led the Saints on a 11-play drive, covering 56 yards in 1:55, ending with a touchdown connection to Moreau from one-yard out to make the score 20-19 as regulation expired, followed by the unsuccessful two-point conversion attempt.

- New Orleans got on the scoreboard with a 21-yard touchdown pass from WR **Cedrick Wilson Jr.** to RB **Alvin Kamara**, putting the Saints on the scoreboard and reducing the team's deficit to 17-7.
- Wilson Jr. tossed his second career touchdown pass, previously doing so one other time against the New York Giants as a member of the Dallas Cowboys in 2020. He is now six-of-six passing in his career with two touchdowns.
- RB **Kendre Miller** led New Orleans with nine carries for 46 yards, averaging 5.1 yards per carry.
- WR **Marquez Valdes-Scantling** had a team-high 64 yards on just two catches, including 39-yard reception, marking the longest play of the game for both teams.
- RB **Alvin Kamara** totaled 70 yards from scrimmage, 58 receiving yards with a touchdown and 12 rushing yards.
- Kamara's team-record 86 touchdowns move him into a tie for 54<sup>th</sup> all-time with RB Ottis Anderson, WR Hines Ward and Pro Football Hall of Fame WR Paul Warfield (Class of 1983).
- Kamara's 25 career receiving touchdowns moves him into a tie for ninth with former Black and Gold WRs Quinn Early and Robert Meachem and moves him into a tie for 18<sup>th</sup> all-time in NFL record books among running backs with James White.
- Kamara's 11,541 career total yards from scrimmage rank 80<sup>th</sup> all-time, surpassing WR Muhsin Muhammad.
- LB **Demario Davis** played in his 111<sup>th</sup> game as a Saint and moved into a tie for 38<sup>th</sup> all-time in Saints record books for games played with G/T Andrus Peat. Davis finished with a season-high 14 tackles (nine solo), including one sack and two tackles for loss. Davis' tenth tackle of the game gave him 100 tackles on the season, which he has done in seven consecutive seasons with the Saints, since signing with the team in 2018 as an unrestricted free agent. Including his tenure with the New York Jets, Davis has eighth consecutive seasons reaching 100 stops in a season and has done it 11 times in his 13-year career.
- DB **Will Harris** made his 50<sup>th</sup> career start on Sunday and his tenth this season in his first year with the Black and Gold. Harris finished second on the team in tackles on Sunday with nine (seven solo).
- DB **Ugo Amadi** played in his 75<sup>th</sup> career game on Sunday. Amadi now has a career-high 49 tackles this season after logging seven stops Sunday, including a 14-yard sack in the second quarter. He also finished the game with one pass breakup.

- DE **Cameron Jordan** totaled six tackles (three solo), including two sacks for a loss of 11 yards. Jordan's 28 multi-sack games is a franchise record, surpassing Pro Football Hall of Fame LB Rickey Jackson (Class of 2010).
- Jordan, who has 120.5 career sacks, became the 23<sup>rd</sup> NFL player with at least 120 takedowns.
- Jordan's sack in the second quarter to force the Washington Commanders to punt and made rookie QB Jayden Daniels the 48<sup>th</sup> player for Jordan to have recorded a sack against.
- S **Tyrann Mathieu** also had six tackles and forced one fumble, while CB **Kool-Aid McKinstry** and DE **Carl Granderson** each had six tackles. Granderson also had one sack.
- DE **Chase Young** had two sacks in the game for a loss of nine yards and finished the game with three tackles. Young finished with two sacks for the second time in his career. He had two takedowns against the New York Giants as a member of the Commanders on Oct.22, 2023.
- CB **Alontae Taylor** has a new career-high 79 tackles in 2024 after registering five stops.
- DB **Shemar Jean-Charles** had a crucial fourth quarter pass breakup to go with a career-high three special teams tackles.
- P **Matt Hayball** has 34 punts downed inside the 20-yard line, a new team record since the statistic was first recorded in 1976. Hayball had two punts downed inside the 20 on Sunday.
- K **Blake Grupe** was two-of-two on field goal attempts in the game with a 51-yard field goal being the longest of the day.

### Opening Statement:

“I’ll start off just by saying that I’m unbelievably proud of our football team. I don’t know if I’ve ever felt like that in 32 years of coaching. Coming off the field, I just told the team that, just a mixture of emotions because we walk off the field with a loss, but I don’t know if I have ever been prouder of a team. It’s certainly a mixed bag there. Obviously, it was a tale of two halves. We did not play the game we wanted to play in the first half. That is a little bit obvious. We had one first down, and 14 total plays. It was not all on the quarterback. We felt like we needed to make a change there at halftime. We did. Spencer Rattler did a great job, came in and provided some spark. Not only that, we only gave up six points in the second half, which gave us a chance to win. As I just told the team, we needed one more play, and unfortunately, we dug too big of a hole there in the first half. We dug a 14-point deficit. Listen, when I took this job on my first day I told you guys and I told everybody that we weren’t going to lack passion and we were not going to lack fight and we were not going to be boring to watch. I’ve never seen a group in there fight harder, be more passionate, and certainly, that was an exciting second half of football. I wish we would have duplicated it for two halves. During halftime, we said we are going to find out a lot about ourselves and how we are going to respond and what kind of fight we have because that’s what we have been talking about for these last five games in six weeks. As I just told the group, I have been extremely proud of the way that everybody in the locker room has handled the situation in the last six weeks in the last five games. I didn’t think I could be any prouder, but I was as proud as I’ve ever been today walking off the field because that was just an unbelievable fight to the finish. We were just one play short.”

### On the decision to start Jake Haener over Spencer Rattler and then make the switch mid-game:

“I think Jake’s first half comes down to a couple of plays. One, he completes that third down ball to Cedrick [Wilson Jr.] for a big play, and we’re going to have really good field position. Then, it gets called back for holding. That was a huge swing because we got sacked on the next play. You guys can look it up, but that’s like a 40-plus-yard swing. That might change the whole entire half for Jake. Then, he had another throw to [Marquez Valdes-Scantling]. MVS had a phenomenal game, but MVS drops that over ball that is on the run. If you take those two plays and we don’t get a holding call, which was suspect, and if we complete that ball, we might be talking and having a different conversation. I just felt like, and the offensive coaches felt like, we just needed a spark in the second half, and that is why we made that decision. I am certainly not down on Jake. Listen, we only had 14 plays. They controlled the clock. They controlled the ball. They did all the things we didn’t want them to do coming into the game. Like I said earlier, it’s not all on Jake.”

### On why a spark was needed outside of Haener’s play:

“We had one first down, and we had zero points. We were kind of reaching there for something. Sometimes, a fresh face in there – I’ve said this before, Jake [Haener] and Spencer [Rattler] are very similar players. I thought there were a couple of plays where Jake had some positives. I thought we held the ball a little too long a couple of times, took a few sacks. It wasn’t all on him, some of the protections as well. Those are the reasons. Sometimes when you’re in one of these games, you’re just stale, and you’re looking for a spark. We just felt like a change of scenery, a change in the position was the way to go.”

### On the team’s response to Spencer Rattler entered the game:

“As I said at halftime to the offense, we just need the first score to get a little momentum going. Sometimes there is a snowball effect. I think, if I am not mistaken, we had one first down in the first half, and we had 16 first downs in the second half. A tale of two halves. It’s just really that initial read, that initial scoring drive to get a little confidence. When there’s a big fat zero up there for a while, there’s

not a lot of confidence going on. Once you get that first score, everybody starts feeling on the sideline like you can do this.”

**On going for the two-point conversion at the end of the game:**

“I’m not going to sit here and tell you it was predetermined before the game. I just felt like the way the game played out, AK [Alvin Kamara] had gone out. He was out for the game. MVS [Marquez Valdes-Scantling] got banged up. We started losing more offensive weapons. You guys felt the momentum shift there at the end. I do not regret it whatsoever. I don’t think the players regret it. They were all in favor of it. I just thought it was the right thing. We managed the clock really well there at the end. I thought that Kendre Miller ran the ball really well there in the two minute, except for maybe the one play which we didn’t block great. We completed the ball to Foster Moreau. We got the ball clocked. We got the touchdown. We left no time on the clock for Washington and Jayden Daniels. That was the plan. We talked during the drive through our two-part plays and stuff like that. When we scored, there was no doubt in my mind that we were going to go for two and go for the win.”

**On what he learned about Spencer Rattler through his performance:**

“It’s the same thing that Spencer has been, and part of the reason we drafted him is Spencer is not the tallest. He does not have the strongest arm. He’s not the most athletic guy, but he’s a gamer. He’s a classic gamer. When you put his college film on, that’s what it was. He’s a gamer. He just has that natural leadership ability. He has some playmaking ability. I know in the three games he started there were some bumps in the road there, but he is a rookie. I think he learned from that experience. It tells me a lot about his character, tells me a lot about his heart. The guy did not flinch. He was excited at halftime to go in the game. He took on a leadership position. He never felt like one time in there that he didn’t belong. All those things, I’m very, very proud of Spencer and just told him the same thing.”

**On the defense handling Jayden Daniels:**

“Would I have signed up for 20 points before the game? Yes. If you told me coming in they were going to have 20, I would have told you we were going to win. [Jayden Daniels] made some plays. That is what he does. That is why he won the Heisman Trophy. That is why he was drafted where he was drafted. That is why he’s having the season he’s having. He’s a phenomenal player. We knew we had to kind of contain him a little bit, but he made some huge plays. He had a couple of runs, two particular that were huge scrambles. He had the fourth down run for them where he jumped over the top. Took a couple of minutes for them off the clock. He had some great throws. That’s what he’s doing. Again, I’d be lying to you if I told you before the game if you told me defensively we were going to give up 20 and we were going to give up six in the second half, I would have signed up for that before. Overall, a solid performance by the defense, but Jayden Daniels is going to make those plays. You’re going to hope to contain some of them, and he made a few on us in crucial moments.”

**On how Spencer Rattler was able to get comfortable in the game after not playing since Week Eight:**

“His preparation. I think that he came into this game knowing we did give him some reps during the week. He had the whole menu of plays. Once we decided that Jake [Haener] was the starter, Spencer prepared himself like he was going to be. You never ever see a bad attitude, sulking, anything like that. This guy is a pro at a very young age. He has been through a lot, obviously transferred around in college. He’s been in a lot of systems. It’s a credit to him. He’s a resilient, resilient person. That showed today. I’m ultra-proud of him.”

**On what caused the second half offensive success:**

“Listen, we only had 14 plays in the first half. It is hard to grade a body of work in the first half because we had some penalties mixed in there. We had some negative plays and got behind the chains. We had third-and what seemed like third-and-double sticks a lot of times. It’s hard to get anything when you have no momentum going there. That’s kind of where we were in the first half.”

**On the official’s call regarding the missed field goal at the end of the third quarter:**

“It got totally mismanaged. They had the diving catch. I did not agree with the call when it was done. I had the challenge flag in my hand. I was talking to the sideline official, and I was looking at the clock. We were discussing on the headset about the quarter is going to end here. They were going to take the quarter. I had the challenge flag in my hand, and I am trying to figure out and communicate with up top on whether we are going to challenge the catch or not. I’m talking to the official and saying, ‘Hey, I might challenge this. I might challenge this. Hey, the quarter’s over, the quarter’s over, the quarter’s over, the quarter’s over, the quarter’s over.’ For about four or five seconds, they let the play go. He



misses the field goal. Whoever's in charge of shutting the play down, they obviously let the play go on. The explanation I got was that it is a replay assist situation. The play should not have been run because the clocks were at zero. The clocks were at zero. The clocks were definitely at zero. The quarter was over, but the officials missed that. That is why the play was allowed to go on. That is where my gripe is. The play should not have been allowed to go on. They gave the field goal kicker basically a freebie. They gave him the miss hit. I've been coaching kickers for 30 years. You give a guy a warmup shot, and you've got a pretty good shot he's going to make the second one. The success rate goes through the roof when a guy gets a second chance. That's where my gripe was. It was a game management, officials operations. I'll let the League handle it. Everybody else gets held accountable in this League. I hope the people that mismanage that get held accountable too. It was completely mishandled."

**On his opinion regarding the penalty on Payton Turner:**

"What made you think I was disagreeing with that? Yeah. I disagreed. You guys saw the play. I'm skating on thin ice as it is, so I'm going to bite my tongue. I disagree with the call. It's a shame that seven points in the game, because it was a one-point game. It's a shame that seven points in the game come down to a penalty on a field goal block and a quarter that was over and they let the play go. That's just a shame. That's not criticism. That's a shame."

**On the explanation given regarding the penalty on Turner:**

"The explanation that I got is that Payton Turner crossed over the long snapper and his back leg brushed over the head of the long snapper. That is the explanation I got. The long snapper is a defenseless player. There is no doubt about that. If anybody is in favor of that, that is me as a special teams background guy. They showed the replay briefly. I'm going to have to go and watch it and get an opinion for myself. On the replay that I saw, that's not really what I saw."

**On if he would have been able to challenge the play prior after the quarter ending field goal no play:**

"Since that field goal was technically a no play, I would have been able to challenge it. We saw multiple views, and the feeling I got from the guys up top was that there was no clear view that that was not a catch. I saw the play on the big board. I didn't really see a great angle. There were multiple angles that our guys who handle the game management and replay stuff felt like there wasn't enough to overturn that."

**On Derek Carr's status in the concussion protocol:**

"I'm not going to get into Derek [Carr]. Derek's still on the injury list. He obviously was impacted today in terms of not being able to play. He's still out right now. He's going to be listed still with the same injuries. I'm not going to get into all the details of that. He didn't have a practice. That's it."

**On the play call for the two-point conversion:**

"Every game you have a couple of two-point plays on the menu. Klint [Kubiak] and the offensive staff felt like that was our best call. Listen, it didn't work out. It is what it is. It was a phenomenal drive getting down there, a phenomenal drive getting in the position to win the game. Unfortunately, we didn't get that last one."

**On if Alvin Kamara got hurt on the touchdown catch:**

"I think that's where Alvin Kamara initially kind of felt something. That's what it sounds like from our medical staff. I will have more information. He's going to get some imaging stuff, so I'll have more on that later."

**On if the two-point conversion was designed to play to Spencer Rattler's strengths:**

"I think that was more of the play call that we liked. You know that Spencer [Rattler] does a great job with the dropback stuff, too. In that specific situation, we felt like we knew the defense we were going to get. We felt like that was our best play call."

**On Kool-Aid McKinstry's status moving forward:**

"All I know is that if we had gone back on defense, I was told he would have gone back in the game. I don't know all the details of it, but I was told during the game on the sideline. I was just told he was good to go back in the game. Thank you, it was a stinger."

**On the decision to go for the win after the touchdown with time expired:**

“I really think two major factors played into this. No. 1, the momentum. We had gotten all the momentum and gained all the momentum back. I felt like if we kicked the extra point and we go to overtime, who knows who gets the ball? Jayden Daniels is a phenomenal player. Kool-Aid had gotten banged up. AK had gotten banged up. MVS had gotten banged up. I was just kind of looking and saying this is our chance to win the game. It was probably No. 1, a momentum thing, and No. 2 all the personnel and where we were in the game. If you told me at halftime, the last play of the game we were going to be throwing the ball to win the game with the way the first half went, I just felt like at that point- Listen I know there’s the old adage about go kick the extra point at home and go for two on the road. We would have went for two in the Rams game, too, just the way the games played out. If we would have been scoring and the game was 45-44, we may have kicked the extra point, may be a different scenario. With where we were, I just felt like it was the right call.”

**On if the two-point conversion attempt and his aggressive play-calling is what he wants to show his players his willing to do:**

“I think so. I don’t think there’s a guy in locker room that regrets that we went for two. There’s not one guy in there that didn’t want to do that. The whole sideline, and believe me, there’s plenty of opinions, but I have to make the final decision. I have zero regret. I don’t think the players do either. We were in position the last play to win it. We had one play from the two-yard line to win the game. With all that moment, I just thought it was the right call.”

**On Kendre Miller’s development:**

“I’m extremely proud of Kendre. I’m really proud of Kendre because of the way he’s handled the last couple of weeks. He’s kind of just tried to block out all the outside noise and work hard, work on the things that he needs to work on – ball security, pass protection, mental. He did have one mental [miscue] in the game earlier. I got on him because I had to burn a timeout because we were in the wrong formation. Listen, Kendre’s whole thing is if he can stay healthy and be consistent with the week-to-week game plan, you can see the player that he’s showed the last two weeks. He is capable. I still think there’s so much football out there for that guy. He’s a guy I’m rooting for because I just think he’s got a brilliant career ahead of him if he can take care of those few things.”

**On if Derek Carr’s availability next week:**

“I don’t know. We get the extra day. Let us see where Derek is. Hopefully an extra day helps his hand heal a little bit more, and we will see if he has function and that kind of stuff. We will reevaluate that. Certainly, Spencer just came off a really good second half here. We will certainly take that into account. I do not want to make any proclamations here. We’ve got the extra day off, and we will kind of see where everyone is at.”

### **Opening comments:**

“For us to go and get one on the road is a big deal for us. Going in, to have the time of possession, we knew that is when we (have) played at our best. Third downs are more manageable, and emphasizing that coming out of our bye on both sides of the ball was going to be big. We knew that we would have to find ways to prove ourselves on third down. I also thought finishing as a plus on the turnover margin was huge too. In a game with missed opportunities, penalties, and missed plays, it was going to get frustrating. There is lots to clean up with those and we will, but that is just December and January football. We went all the way down on the last play and when we talked about the fight of the group, I think we embodied that. It’s all about becoming battle-hardened.”

### **On how he thought the team handled the winning-time moments:**

“They were good and bad. There were some spaces for the bad where we missed a kick and things like that, and obviously when you play indoors, you want to take shots with your kicker.”

### **On how difficult the decision was to try to kick the 54-yard field goal:**

“We thought we were in the space to kick and you make those decisions before the game. We said that if it was in the middle and inside the 38 we would kick. So, it wasn’t necessarily a hard decision because we had planned for it. We didn’t like the outcome but we will clean that up.”

### **On Spencer Rattler coming in and making a difference in the second half:**

“He [Rattler] certainly played well. He made some big plays and you saw that coming out of college. Sometimes, when you have nothing to lose, you can sling it and play free, good football. Not saying he [Rattler] did that, but we’ve all seen it before when guys come in and make a big difference like that after sitting behind guys. I think he made some big plays, and that trick play with Cedric Wilson Jr. to [Alvin] Kamara was huge.”

### **On what it meant for Jayden Daniels to be back in Louisiana:**

“Obviously, he has had a lot of success here personally, so a lot of people that have made a big impact on his life were here. He did a great job, though. He [Daniels] is pretty remarkable in that way as a mature, young player where he doesn’t ride the rollercoaster too much. That’s not easy to do as someone who gets as much attention as he does. For Marshon [Lattimore] too, as his first game back from injury was against his former team.”

**On what the Saints did to garner so much pressure and sacks:**

“I thought they did a great job at stunting today. I really do want to watch the film because we like to go back and look at things we could’ve done better, especially in that department. We have looked over it and sometimes we pause, but every little second counts. As we are going through moments like these, they are learning moments for Jayden. Obviously it’s not on one person or one group in particular, but when you get those coupled with penalties, you put yourself in a bad spot.”

**On how hard it was to lose their starting center the morning of the game:**

“It is part of the game and there was nothing we could do. He tried to go, but he is a big guy and had a strong fever, so it is just hard to go out there with that. We are fortunate with Michael (Deiter) with the experience he has and that he was ready to go once he learned that he was starting. The hardest part is not receiving all of those full reps to go through it, but he is definitely somebody we can count on. It happens in football all the time, and you hate to do it right before a game, but it’s not a lot different than someone who got injured during the game.”

### QB JAKE HAENER

#### On how he felt about his performance:

“Obviously I’m disappointed. You go out there and you make a good play, third play of the game, and it gets called back holding call, which is tough. Credit to the guys in the second half. I thought Spencer [Rattler] did a great job coming in and handling the moment of the game and he did a really good job moving the team. Gave us a chance for a win at the end, and I was proud of how he handled himself.”

#### On regrets from first half:

“I’ll have to go back and look at the tape, that is the biggest thing. The only thing I can really think of that comes to mind is trying to force the ball to AK Alvin Kamara when we are down. Learning from that and not making that mistake again. Overall, I felt like that was probably my one bad decision. When you go back and look at it, you will probably say the same. But obviously, I didn’t get enough first downs, I didn’t move the team, and Spencer came in and did a great job.”

#### On whether momentum was impacted:

“My biggest thing is trying to go one play at a time. There were points there that just didn’t happen for us for whatever reason. My biggest thing is trying to go one play at a time, then the next play, and today didn’t go my way.”

#### On impact when completion to Cedrick Wilson Jr. was called back due to holding:

“It’s tough. You are trying to make plays, trying to do whatever you can to try and get first downs, and when something happens like that, you have just got to take a deep breath and go to the next play. Obviously you look at the big choice route I had to AK early, and then get sacked next play. It’s on me, I’ve got to step up in the pocket and make something happen with my feet. Just things like that you learn and grow from.”

#### On not getting opportunity to play in second half:

“Listen, I obviously want to be able to go and not have that leash be that tight. I felt like I wanted to go out there and have an opportunity to play a full game, but sometimes it’s not up to me. I’ve got to do what I can to prepare each week. I feel like my teammates were confident in me if I got the opportunity to go in the second half. You guys see how these games go. Sometimes, even when Derek [Carr]’s in there, one half looks like this, and the next half is totally different. You saw that today and obviously I’m disappointed that we lost, first of all, but second of all, that I didn’t get the opportunity.”

#### On how he was informed of decision to start Spencer Rattler in the second half:

“They just came up to me and told me that Spencer was going to get the first opportunity to go in the second half. Like I said, disappointed, would’ve loved the opportunity to go out there and compete with the guys in the second half and have a chance to go and see what their second half game plan was. They continue to pressure us, they continue to play through deep three under, and get to some of the calls that we talk about, and move the launch point. But for whatever reason, we didn’t have those opportunities in the first half, and made them count when it mattered in the second.”

#### On difficulty developing rhythm with only 24 snaps in the first half:

“You can make whatever excuse you want for yourself. At the end of the day, my job is to move the team, and if I’m not doing that, then I’m not doing my job. I could sit here and feel sorry for myself and go cry to all of you guys, but at the end of the day, I’ve got to go get better and put my head down, and not listen to all the hate I’m about to receive from everybody, and just keep being myself.”



## **DE CAMERON JORDAN**

### **On the decision to go for two at the end of the game:**

“Why not? I mean, the momentum was there, [Spencer] Rattler was playing his ass off, big confidence boost for the young QB, and the way that the energy felt, there wasn't anybody on the sideline that didn't think we weren't going to make that.”

### **On what part of gameplan allowed the defense to make eight sacks:**

“Hard work, effort, and the trust in the gameplan of letting guys win off their edge or that interior, whatever it was, instead of trying to over gameplan. It was simplifying. BY-Brian Young, who I am going to keep speaking high praises on, just the way he was able to realize talents and utilize the D-line to best abilities since he sort of took over. You can see it, the night and day sort of gameplay. You have a D-line coach who's sort of an x's and o's guy, versus a guy who's actually played the game and has been a D-lineman (player or coach) for thirty plus years. You can see the effects.”

### **On his two-sack game and how he has felt recently:**

“I am trying to get a win. I can have all types of personal feelings, but I have always said that personal accolades, everything else, I will talk about that after the season. I'm trying to win somehow, someway. Does it feel great to be sitting at 120.5 career sacks? Yeah. But would it have felt better with the win? Absolutely. Three games left, got to be able to make the most of those. If it's not about winning, I really don't want to talk about it.”

### **On facing Jayden Daniels:**

“It was annoying. [Jayden Daniels] took off for like, 60 yards. It was going to be annoying. You knew he was elusive. If he got past that first read, he was able to extend the pocket out. There's a reason why he's been electric this year. We knew going in we'd have to break down those lanes, and even when you want to go take your dive at him, you have to make sure you have your defense rallying. I think that our guys did a great job of rallying. At some point, you knew that just because you win the rush doesn't mean you're going to win. You win the rush, you have to be aware of where Jayden is. That's something that we have to go move on to the next game with. We have another mobile type quarterback coming up. Talking about Jordan Love, he's a great pocket passer, but he can extend plays with his feet as well.”

### **On approach to tackling Daniels:**

“I mean, if you hit him too hard, it's a roughing the passer. If you don't hit him hard enough, then he's a guy who lifts and runs and is an athlete, is overly competitive, overly athletic, so if he pushes for a double, then you've got to push for a double. Sometimes you've got to suplex him.”

### **On whether Chase Young was extra motivated facing his former team:**

“Kudos to Chase. He's really turned it on these last few weeks, and I think that's just the edge that he's had going into this final turn. For sure today we felt that energy early on, but there wasn't a surplus of energy just because it was the Commanders. He's been a great addition to the pass rush and the way that we're able to attack.”

### **On differences he's seen in the D-line throughout the season:**

“It was a middle-read game between me and Bryan [Bresee]. A lot of sacks this year, you could run in between those interior games, it could go one of either way. I'm glad it went my way.”

## **QB SPENCER RATTLER**

### **On how he was told he'd be starting the second half:**

“[Andrew] Janocko told me with about 30 seconds left in the second quarter that I'd be going in, so I just had to shift my mindset, but I felt prepared from the start of the game just in case. I wasn't the emergency third this week, I was the backup, so I had to have my mind right.”

### **On whether being the backup changed his approach:**

“No, honestly. I didn’t have a lot of time on task this week with the guys, so I just had to come out of halftime and trust in what they do. These guys are incredible, how they filled up front wideouts, tight ends, running backs, so credit to them.”

**On his experience coming in mid-game for the first time:**

“I think we had some more guys healthy than last time. I think that is big. Erik [McCoy], Cesar [Ruiz], Lucas [Patrick], having MVS Marquez Valdes-Scantling out there, Kevin [Austin Jr.], Ced Cedrick Wilson Jr., Kendre [Miller], AK Alvin Kamara for most of the game. It was good to have all those guys out there. Defense, same thing. Played lights out, I thought. Kept us in that game, and we were one play away.”

**On what he saw on the failed two-point conversion attempt:**

“I thought Juwan [Johnson] got held, but there are good players in this league. It is tough to make those plays. I liked the aggression. I liked what we did there.”

**On when he knew they’d go for the win:**

“We knew before the drive. We wanted to go down there and win the game. I think that’s the mindset our whole team had. I’m proud of the team, because nobody flinched that whole game. Halftime, coming out, nobody flinched. We believed that we could come out and go win the game, and we were an inch away, so got to be proud of that.”

**On the team’s trust in him to go for two-point conversion:**

“I loved Klint [Kubiak]’s aggression. In that second half, I thought he called a great game. I thought the guys played really well up front. We protected the ball, moved the chains, [Blake] Grupe made some big kicks. We wanted to finish with seven points down there, but Grupe came in, knocked two down, and gave us a shot, and we went down and scored. Foster [Moreau] had some big time plays, Kendre had some big time runs, O-line blocked their butts off, so credit to them.”

**On patience and clock management during last drive:**

“I just think, playing ball, understanding the situation, getting mental reps throughout the week in practice, seeing how two minutes manufacture how you’re supposed to run it. I thought we ran it to a T and went down there with no time on the clock and had a chance to win. It was an impressive drive from the guys, great calls by Klint, and great job by the defense setting us up to get that drive.”

**On getting opportunity again after earlier games this season:**

“I knew I’d have to be ready no matter what. What I am learning is that this league is crazy. Could be one thing another week, and something new the next, so just always staying ready. I think that is what it comes down to. I think this time I just went out there and played my style of game. I wanted to cut it loose, play free, and was happy Klint had that trust in our offense to go down there and execute, and set up a chance to win the game.”

**On how a game like this impacts his confidence:**

“I think it’s great to get out there and prove something. I’ve just kind of been sitting back and watching how Derek [Carr] plays. Just watching everything, learning. I think it was good to sit back and watch how it’s supposed to be done for a few weeks, but again, third guy, second guy, first guy, you’ve got to stay ready no matter what. Credit to Coach Janocko, Klint, for preparing us throughout the week. They Did a heck of a job this week.”

**On if performance validates preparation:**

“It definitely gives you confidence, but you’ve got to do it over and over. I didn’t have any reps with the ones this week, so to be able to go out there and have that connection with them, I think that’s big. Just to be able to adjust to things going on. Again, it wasn’t just me. We’ve got 11 guys on the field. Like [Darren] Rizzi says, one eleventh. I feel like everybody on the offensive side of the ball did their one eleventh that second half.”

**On whether today’s performance was more like what he wanted out of his previous games:**

“No doubt. I was confident going in and felt prepared. I do not think we took any sacks, O-line did a great job, we ran the ball pretty well, converted when we needed to on third down. I think we were great on third down in the second half. Just got to still finish in the red zone. There were still some plays out

there to be made. I think trying to force that one into Juwan, up the seam, [Frankie] Luvu, number four, made a good play on that. I should have put more touch on it. Just thinking of other plays. We could've definitely been better, but we gave ourselves a shot, and that's credit to my guys."

**On importance of his third-and-ten pass to Dante Pettis during his first drive:**

"Yeah, confident. Coach Janocko prepares us for that look every week, we have that play. Looking for MVS first deep, they took that away, and we've seen so many clips of them bending that in on the dig, and Dante [Pettis] made a great catch. I actually threw it a little behind him, but he made a great catch and got upfield, and it was a big conversion. Then, obviously, Cedrick with the dime to AK. A great catch there, get some juice going, get some sparks going, momentum, and that was great for us coming out of the half."

**On reaction to Wilson's touchdown pass to Kamara:**

"I obviously knew it would work. We have been holding that one in the holster for a little bit. I'm happy Klint called it. It was the perfect time to call it."

**On whether the team appreciates Rizzi's aggressive approach with going for two:**

"100 percent. Sitting at where we're at, we've got to go out there and win the game. I love the aggression, I love the mindset. I think we need that."

**On his completion to Valdes-Scantling to set the tone:**

"That was the exact look we repped this week. Their defense is a really good defense, holding until the last second. Snapping the ball, they got to it too high, and I knew the middle of the field was going to be there. Honestly, I probably took one or two more hitches than I needed to, and made it harder on myself, but Quez made a great catch. (The) O-line blocked just enough, and that was a big-time catch by him."

## **TE FOSTER MOREAU**

**On his touchdown:**

"Credit everyone else. Credit all of the ten other guys for getting their jobs done just so I can have the ball on the front pad and just be able to come down with it."

**On Spencer Rattler's performance:**

"Huge, especially on that first play to MVS. It was a big time play. He (Rattler) is a big-time player. He just did an exceptional job. He didn't get that many reps during the week, so to come in and cut it loose there is impressive. There is a lot of detail in the offense, especially the motions and the shifts and everything that we try to pride ourselves on, try to open up running lanes and passing lanes, and stuff like that. Credit to him. He didn't miss a single beat. He's awesome. Every time breaking the huddle, he's giving out reminders. For a rookie quarterback to come in and do that in the fifth game that he's played is pretty exceptional."

**On how tough the loss is after coming back in the second half like they did:**

"Credit everyone else. Credit everyone for just giving us a chance to be able to be there at the last second and to have a chance to win the game is such a huge opportunity. We never lost faith, hope or belief. There is just elation on the sideline when they the Commanders missed the kick, because at that point, we know what is going to happen. We are going to go down, we are going to score and going for two. That is just what we are going to do. Credit the understanding in just the last couple of seconds of the game to get the ball spiked, have everyone on the same page and have seven guys on the ball. It seems like an easy thing, but, in reality, when the clock is ticking like that, it become very difficult."
