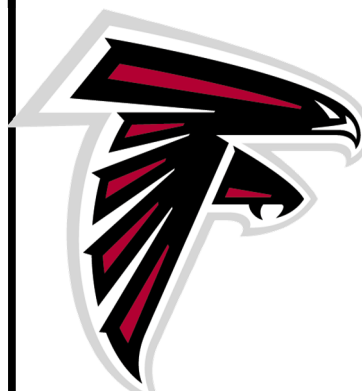

THE MATCHUP

After a 27-19 loss at the Minnesota Vikings on November 12, followed by a Week 11 bye, the New Orleans Saints (5-5) return to division play in the rugged NFC South when they take on the Atlanta Falcons (4-6) at Mercedes-Benz Stadium on Sunday afternoon. The Saints are a game ahead of the Falcons and Tampa Bay Buccaneers in an open NFC South divisional race.

Through the first ten games of the season, the offense has established itself with a group of proven playmakers in running back **Alvin Kamara**, quarterback **Taysom Hill** and second-year wide receivers **Chris Olave** and **Rashid Shaheed**. Kamara leads New Orleans in rushing and has become the franchise's all-time touchdown leader (75) with the team's yards from scrimmage record in sight. Hill's made an impact in both the run game and passing game in a season where he has made history, becoming the only player in the Super Bowl era with 10+ touchdowns passing, rushing and receiving. Olave leads the team in receiving with 56 grabs for 657 yards and three touchdowns. Shaheed is ranked third in the NFL with 1,154 all-purpose yards, making an impact on offense and special teams.

Through the midway point of the season, linebacker **Demario Davis** leads the team with 73 tackles and ranks second with four sacks. Defensive end **Carl Granderson** has a club-best 5.5 takedowns, while cornerback **Paulson Adebo** leads the team with six takeaways. New Orleans is ranked eighth in the league in both total defense and opponent points per game.

New Orleans' special teams have been off to a productive start. Rashid is ranked second in the NFL in punt return average. New Orleans ranks second in the league in opponent punt return average (5.1) with second-year linebacker **D'Marco Jackson** leading the unit with six stops. The rookie kicker/punter combination of **Blake Grupe** and **Lou Hedley** have continued to progress.

New Orleans will be looking for their fourth consecutive victory against the Falcons and their sixth straight in Mercedes-Benz Stadium. The Saints currently lead the all-time regular season series 54-53. In 2022, New Orleans swept the season series for the fourth time in five seasons.

THE COACHES

Dennis Allen was hired as the 17th head coach in New Orleans Saints history on February 8, 2022. Now in his 28th year coaching and 21st in the NFL, Allen has spent 13 seasons in New Orleans in two separate stints, including the six-and-a-half campaigns (2015-21) as the team's defensive coordinator prior to being promoted to head coach. He succeeded Sean Payton, who coached the team for 16 seasons, including the 2009 campaign, when Allen was secondary coach and ended with the Super Bowl XLIV championship. When Allen took control of a Black and Gold defense in Week 11 of the 2015 season that was ranked 32nd both in opponent net yards per game and opponent points per game, he methodically molded a unit that has finished in the top 10 in both categories each of the last three years. From 2017 to the present, New Orleans is the only defense in the NFL to rank in the top five in the National Football League in both opponent rushing yards per game and sacks.

In his first year as head coach of the Saints, Allen guided New Orleans through the challenge of significant injuries at several positions to win three of their last four games after a Week 14 bye and give up 20 or fewer points in the final eight contests of the season, ten points apiece in the final three.

Carrying over to the 2023 season, a stingy Saints defense is tied for second in the NFL with 12 interceptions and ranked in opponent net yards per game, opponent net passing yards per game and opponent points per game, with New Orleans currently in first place in the NFC South heading into Sunday's pivotal division matchup.

Before rejoining the Saints coaching staff in 2015, Allen served as head coach of the Oakland Raiders from 2012-14 and as defensive coordinator of the Denver Broncos in 2011. Prior to his first stint in New Orleans from 2006-10, Allen was also an assistant with the Atlanta Falcons from 2002-05, where he received his NFL coaching start.

Over the course of his coaching career in New Orleans, Allen has coached linebacker Demario Davis and defensive end Cameron Jordan to career seasons. Davis has led the team in tackles in every campaign since signing with the club as an unrestricted free agent in 2018 and has garnered AP All-Pro honors four straight times. Since Allen returned to New Orleans in 2015, Jordan's 88.5 sacks rank third in the NFL.

Allen played safety at Texas A&M from 1992-95, where he started the final 21 games of his college career before being signed as an undrafted free agent by the Buffalo Bills in 1996. Prior to entering the National Football League coaching ranks in 2002, Allen served as a graduate assistant at his alma mater from 1996-99 and as secondary coach at the University of Tulsa from 2000-2001. He

earned a bachelor of business administration degree and a master's in kinesiology from Texas A&M.

Raised in Hurst, Texas, Allen and his wife, Alisson, have a daughter, Layla and a son, Garrison.

Arthur Smith was named the 18th head coach in Atlanta Falcons history on January 15, 2021 after serving as the Tennessee Titans offensive coordinator from 2019-20. In 2021, Smith helped the Falcons improve from a 4-12 record in 2020 to 7-10 marks in 2021 and 2022 and has Atlanta tied for second place in the NFC South in 2023.

Smith orchestrated one of the NFL's top offenses with the Titans from 2019-20, leading the league in red-zone touchdown percentage (75.2), ranking fifth in points per game (27.9) and total offense (379.6). He oversaw the NFL's second-ranked rushing attack, averaging 153.5 yards per game on the ground. The Titans were among the league's best in the red zone. The club's 75.6 (2019) and 75.0 (2020) red zone touchdown percentages are the fourth and fifth-best single-season marks by a team since 2000.

In 2020, Smith's offense averaged 30.7 points per game and 491 total points, good for fourth in the NFL and the second-highest marks in team history. He also oversaw one of the most potent rushing attacks in league history as Derrick Henry became just the eighth player in NFL history to rush for more than 2,000 yards in a single season. Henry's 2,027 rushing yards rank fifth all-time and paced the Titans to the league's second-best rushing offense in 2020. Tennessee's 168.1 yards per game on the ground set a club record and Henry eclipsed Chris Johnson's franchise record of 2,006 rushing yards set in 2009.

Smith served under four different Titans head coaches, working his way up from his 2011 position of defensive assistant/quality control coach. He also spent time as an offensive assistant/quality control coach (2012), offensive line/tight ends asst. (2013), and assistant tight ends coach (2014-15) before taking over as tight ends coach during the 2015 season and holding the position through 2018.

Prior to joining the Titans, Smith spent two years as the defensive quality control coach for the Washington Commanders from 2007-08 serving on legendary coach Joe Gibbs' staff. In addition to his coaching role, he also worked as a college scouting assistant in Washington in 2007. In 2010, Smith worked at the University of Mississippi as an administrative assistant/defensive intern, primarily working with the linebackers.

Smith graduated from North Carolina where he played offensive line and later joined the coaching staff as a graduate assistant (2006), working with the offensive line.

Born and raised in Memphis, Tenn., he went to high school at Georgetown Prep. Smith and his wife, Allison, have two sons, Tanner and Liam, and one daughter, Sophie.

SERIES HISTORY

The Saints lead the Falcons in the regular season series 54-53, with New Orleans holding a 24-10 advantage over the Falcons since 2006. Since 1991, 36 games have been decided by eight points or less. The Falcons had a 10-game winning streak from 1995-99, which remains the Saints' longest winless streak against an opponent. New Orleans took 13-of-16 in the rivalry from 1986-94 and Atlanta won nine-straight over the fledgling Saints from 1969-73. Atlanta's most recent mastery over a five-year period ended with a 21-19 win for New Orleans at the Georgia Dome on Nov. 22, 2000. Eight games in the series have gone into overtime.

In the 107 regular season games of the series there has been:

- 2,281 points scored by New Orleans, 2,370 allowed.
- A ten-game Atlanta winning streak from 1995-99.
- A six-game win streak for New Orleans from 1986-89.
- 45 games decided by double-digits.
- 17 games decided by 21 or more points.
- 54 games decided by seven points or less.
- 4 games decided by one point.
- A 38-point win by Saints (11/1/87) - Biggest Saints win.
- A 55-point loss by Saints (9/16/73) - Biggest Saints loss.

- Four shutouts - Two by each club, the most recent a 38-0 win in Atlanta on 11/1/87.

- Eight overtime games— four wins by each club.

- Six Monday night games, two Sunday night games and eight Thursday night games, including Thanksgiving night in 2018 and 2019.

Passing Game Coordinator/Quarterbacks Coach **Ronald Curry** - A seventh round draft pick (235th overall) of the Oakland Raiders in 2002 out of the University of North Carolina and played for Oakland from 2002-08, appearing in 76 games with 32 starts, registering 193 receptions for 2,347 yards with 13 touchdowns.

Assistant Offensive Line Coach **Kevin Carberry** - Prior to entering the coaching ranks, Carberry competed in training camps of the Cleveland Browns (2005) and Carolina Panthers (2006) and spent the 2005 season on the Detroit Lions practice squad. He also played for the Berlin Thunder of NFL Europe in the spring of 2006. From 2007-08, Carberry played in the Arena Football League for the New York Dragons and Philadelphia Soul and was a member of the Soul's 2008 Arena Bowl Championship squad, starting his coaching career at Chicago high schools in the off-seasons.

Offensive Assistant **Jahri Evans** - Evans was selected by the Saints in the fourth round (108th overall) of the 2006 NFL Draft and spent the first 11 seasons of his 12-year playing career with the Saints. Overall, he started 183 career regular season games at right guard for the Saints (2006-16) and Green Bay Packers (2017), 169 for the Black and Gold. He was inducted into the Saints Hall of Fame in 2020, the Louisiana Sports Hall of Fame in 2022 and was a semifinalist for the Pro Football Hall of Fame's Class of 2023.

Defensive Assistant **Matt Giordano** - Giordano was a fourth round draft pick of the Indianapolis Colts in 2005 and enjoyed a nine-year NFL career with the Colts (2005-08), Green Bay Packers (2009), Saints (2010), Oakland Raiders (2011-12) and St. Louis Rams (2013), starting 30-of-116 career games, accumulating 202 tackles, one sack, 11 interceptions, including two returned for touchdowns, 16 passes defensed, two forced fumbles, 52 special teams stop and one coverage fumble recovery. He also appeared in seven postseason games for the Colts and Packers and was a member of Indianapolis' Super Bowl XLI championship team.

BUCKING THE ODDS

The Saints have a long tradition of finding players as free agents signed after the draft that make an impact immediately or developing their careers initially on the team's practice squad. Several undrafted Saints on the roster play key roles on offense, defense and special teams that the club developed.

Wide Receiver/Return Specialist **Rashid Shaheed** came to New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Weber State in 2022 after being one of the all-time best Division FCS returners and after spending the first five weeks on the practice squad, made an immediate impact, becoming the only Saint to score a touchdown in each of his first two offensive touches. In the December 18 win over Atlanta, he finished with three receptions for 95 yards, with a 68-yard touchdown grab from Taysom Hill, the longest play from scrimmage of the season for New Orleans and the fifth-longest receiving TD by a Saints rookie all-time. On the Christmas Eve win at Cleveland in challenging conditions, Shaheed led the team in receiving with four grabs for 41 yards. In the January 1 victory at Philadelphia, he led the team in receiving for the third consecutive week, posting six receptions for 79 yards, including a 58-yard grab to set up a field goal. Overall, he carried four times for 57 yards with a 44-yard touchdown, caught 28 passes for 488 yards (17.4 avg.) with two TDs, returned 20 punts for 193 yards (9.7 avg.) and returned 14 kickoffs for 320 yards (22.9 avg.).

In 2023, Shaheed is no longer a secret, as he has caught 31 passes for 525 yards (16.9 avg.) with three touchdown grabs to tie for the team lead, including six receptions of 40-or-more yards, while also carrying six times for 33 yards and ranking first in the NFC and second in the NFL in punt return average (14.9) and third in the league in all purpose yards (1,154). On Sept. 24 in Green Bay, he had his first career punt return for a touchdown, the second-longest scoring return in franchise history (76 yards). Oct. 1, vs. Tampa Bay, Shaheed had a 29-yard return, making him the first Saint to have a return of at least 25 yards in back

to back contests since Darren Sproles (9/25-10/2/11).

Oct. 29, at Indianapolis, Shaheed had a breakout performance, catching three passes for 153 yards (51.0 avg.), including a 58-yard touchdown grab. Shaheed's 51.0 yards per reception average was ranked third in team history as he became only the third Saint to record 150+ yards receiving on three catches. Shaheed also added four punt returns for 46 yards to total 199 all-purpose yards.

TE **Juwan Johnson** led his position group with four touchdown receptions in 2021, converting to the position after playing wide receiver in college and starting his Black and Gold career in 2020 as a wideout on the practice squad after signing as an undrafted free agent from Oregon. In 2022, he led his position group in receiving with 42 grabs for 508 yards with a club-best and career-high seven TDs, tied for third at the position in the NFL. Johnson leads the Saints with 12 receiving touchdowns over the past three seasons, tied for eighth among league tight ends.

Missing four contests (calf), Johnson has 14 grabs for 97 yards with his first touchdown, a three-yard grab, Nov. 5 vs. Chicago, as part of tying his career-high with five receptions.

Defensive end **Carl Granderson** played in 15 games in 2021 with three starts and posted 24 tackles and three sacks. In 2022, he posted 53 stops (30 solo) and a career-high 5.5 sacks, recovering the first fumble of his career, Dec. 5 at Tampa Bay. In the Christmas Eve win at Cleveland, Granderson, sacked Browns QB Deshaun Watson at the Saints 22-yard line on fourth down with 19 seconds left in the fourth quarter to secure the win. The following week on January 1, 2023 at Philadelphia, he posted two stops, 1.5 sacks of QB Gardner Minshew, one stop for loss and two quarterback hits, as Granderson posted at least half a takedown in three consecutive weeks for the first time in his career.

Earning the starting right defensive end position in 2023, Granderson has posted 44 tackles, leads the team with 5.5 sacks to tie a career-high, and has forced a fumble and recovered one, signing a four-year contract extension on September 23.

P **Lou Hedley** was signed following the 2023 NFL Draft by the Saints out of the University of Miami, where he played from 2019-22 and punted 206 times for 9,315 yards with a 45.2 gross punting average and 77 inside-the-20. The Australia native, who won the punting job in a punting competition in training camp at 30 years old earned All-ACC second-team honors in 2021 and was selected as a semifinalist for the Ray Guy Award, honoring the nation's top punter. In 2020, Hedley was recognized with AP second-team All-American honors and a Ray Guy Award finalist, as the Hurricanes ranked second in the FBS in net punting average. In 2023, he has punted 49 times for 2,109 yards with a 43.0 gross punting average, a 40.0 net and 21 inside the 20-yard line.

Kicker **Blake Grupe** was signed by New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Notre Dame, where he played his graduate campaign in 2022, after handling kicking duties at Arkansas State from 2017-21. In 2022, he led the Fighting Irish with 91 points on 14-of-19 field goals and a perfect 49-for-49 in PATs. The Missouri native was Arkansas State's career record holder in scoring (354), field goals (64) and PATs (162).

In ten games, Grupe has made 19 of 24 field goal attempts and all 19 PAT attempts to lead the team with 76 points, with 47 touchbacks on kickoffs, tied for second in the NFL.

Grupe enjoyed a standout performance in the Oct. 8 34-0 shutout with a career-long 54-yard field goal and a 53-yarder and hitting all four PATs to go with five of his seven kickoffs sailing into the end zone for touchbacks. Grupe became the first Saint to boot two field goals of at least 50 yards in a contest since John Carney (at StL, 9/26/04), only the fifth Saint to do so overall and only the sixth occurrence. He earned NFC Special Teams Player of the Week.

Wide Receiver **Keith Kirkwood** originally joined the Saints as an undrafted free agent out of Temple in 2018. The New Jersey native spent the first two months of his rookie season on the New Orleans practice squad, before being signed to the active roster at midseason and recording 13 receptions for 209 yards (16.1 avg.) with two touchdowns. He added one more scoring grab in the NFC Divisional playoff win over Philadelphia to help the Saints advance to the NFC Championship. After spending most of the 2019 campaign on Injured Reserve and playing for Carolina from 2020-21, Kirkwood returned to New Orleans in 2022, where he contributed on offense and special teams. 0 – Number of points surrendered by New Orleans in the Oct. 8 31-0 shutout at New England. With the defense under Head Coach Dennis Allen's supervision since 2016, the Saints have had four of the franchise's 17 shutouts.

New Orleans is the only team to have three shutouts since 2021. The Saints have had at least one shutout in each of the past three seasons for the first time since the 1987-89 teams (1986-89)

1 – With the Sept. 10 16-15 season-opening win over Tennessee, Allen became the first Saints head coach to win his first two season openers in charge of the team.

2 – Jordan become only the second Saint to play in 200 regular season contests on Oct. 29 at Indianapolis. On Sunday vs. Chicago, he became only the second Saint to open 200 regular season contests.

PRACTICE MAKES PERFECT

A spot on the practice squad is another avenue to eventually get onto the active roster and have the opportunity to contribute. Below is an overview of eight key contributors players on the club's 53-man roster with extensive practice squad experience.

Tight End **Juwan Johnson** was signed by New Orleans out of Oregon, where he spent his graduate transfer season, following the 2020 NFL Draft as a wideout. Recording four receptions for 39 yards in seven contests, Johnson spent the majority of his rookie season on the practice squad. Converted to tight end in 2021 and leading the position group with four touchdowns, Johnson took advantage of his first full offseason strength and conditioning program in 2022, led the tight ends group with 42 receptions for 508 yards with a club-best seven TD grabs, tied for third in the league at his position. In 2023, Johnson leads the tight ends with 14 grabs and one touchdown despite missing four games with a calf injury.

After spending his first three seasons with the Seattle Seahawks, contributing on both defense and special teams, defensive back **Ugo Amadi** split the 2022 campaign between the Titans active roster and the Kansas City Chiefs practice squad, also appearing in one contest for Super Bowl champion Kansas City. Possessing the versatility to play in multiple roles, Amadi secured a roster spot with the Saints in the 2023 preseason, recording eight tackles, one interception, two passes defended and one coverage stop. He has contributed on both defense with one tackle and two passes defended and on special teams in all ten contests.

After splitting his rookie season in 2018 between the practice squad and active roster, defensive back **J.T. Gray** enjoyed a breakthrough campaign in 2019, when he was selected *Associated Press* second-team All-Pro when he recorded 16 special teams tackles, one blocked punt and one coverage fumble recovery. In 2021, he was selected as a first-team All-Pro and to his first career Pro Bowl (starter), when he led the NFL with 19 special teams tackles (league-leading 16 solo). Gray led the team with 12 special teams stops in 2022, despite missing three games with a hamstring, the third time in four seasons, he has led New Orleans in coverage tackles. He has four special teams stops and one defensive tackle in 2023 despite missing three games with injuries. Backed by Gray's performance, leadership and knowledge, New Orleans is ranked first in the NFC and second in the NFL in opponent punt return average (5.1).

WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed** came to New Orleans as one of the all-time best Division I-AA returners and after spending the first five weeks on the practice squad, made a quick impact on Oct. 16 vs. Cincinnati with a 44-yard rushing TD. With his 53-yard receiving touchdown on October 20 at Arizona, Shaheed became the only Saint to score touchdowns on each of his first two career offensive touches. In addition to finishing with 28 grabs for 488 yards (17.4 avg.) with two touchdowns, Shaheed also handled return duties for New Orleans since being activated, bringing back 20 punts for 193 yards (9.7 avg.). He made big contributions in the Sept. 10 season opening win over Tennessee with a career-high 216 all-purpose yards, including five receptions for 89 yards, including a 19-yard touchdown and a late fourth quarter 41-yard grab to help secure the victory. In the Sept. 18 win over Carolina, he posted four catches for 63 yards (15.8 avg.), including a fourth quarter 45-yard grab. On Sept. 24 at Green Bay, Shaheed had a 76-yard punt return for a touchdown.

In 2023, Shaheed has caught 31 passes for 523 yards (16.9 avg.) with three touchdown receptions to tie for the team lead, including six grabs of 40-or-more yards, while also carrying six times for 33 yards and ranking first in the NFC and second in the NFL in punt return average (14.0) and third in the league in all-purpose yards (1,154).

WR **Keith Kirkwood** originally joined the Saints as an undrafted free agent out of Temple in 2018. Originally a third round draft pick of the Broncos in 2018 out of Boston College, CB **Isaac Yiadom** has played in 80 games with 21 starts for Denver, the Giants, Green Bay,

Houston and New Orleans and has posted 120 tackles, a split sack, two interceptions, 19 passes defended, one forced fumble and 24 special teams stops. After starting 2022 with the Texans, Yiadom joined the Saints practice squad midway through the season and upon being signed to the active roster, recorded two special teams stops in six appearances.

On the following pages are a synopsis of several returning players and newcomers through the draft and free agency to the 2023 Saints offensive line:

RT Ryan Ramczyk - The Black and Gold used their second first round selection in the 2017 NFL Draft to snag Ramczyk out of Wisconsin, one of the best offensive linemen in the entire draft. After opening all 16 games and both postseason contests in 2017 and being selected as a PFWA All-Rookie, he has been selected as an AP All-Pro selection three times since. After missing seven contests in 2021, Ramczyk rebounded to open the first 16 games in 2022 and continues to anchor the right side of the line.

T/G James Hurst - A nine-year NFL veteran who was signed as a free agent from Baltimore in 2020, Hurst has 142 career regular season appearances with 87 starts at four different positions on the inside and outside. His versatility came in handy in 2020, as he started two contests at left tackle and one at left guard, while the Saints gained over 200 yards rushing each time. In 2021, Hurst moved into the lineup for eight games at left tackle in place of an injured Armstead, two at left guard in place of an injured Andrus Peat and three at right tackle for an injured Ryan Ramczyk. Hurst started 15 games at left tackle and one at left guard in 2022. In 2023, Hurst has opened six games at left guard, one at left tackle and one at right guard.

T/G Andrus Peat - A first round selection (13th overall) in the 2015 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Peat was considered one of the top college linemen in 2014. In nine seasons, he's played in 103 regular season games with 94 starts, opening a contest at every position except center. In 2020, he opened 13 contests at left guard as he was part of the NFC Pro squad for the third consecutive season. In 2021, he opened the first six contests, where New Orleans got off to a 4-2 start before suffering a season-ending pec-toral injury. In his return to the starting lineup in the 2022 season opener in Atlanta, New Orleans rushed for 151 yards. In back-to-back weeks, Peat was a part of rushing efforts of 200-yards plus by the club for the first time since 2020. In 2023, Peat has started one contest at left guard and the last four at left tackle.

C/G Erik McCoy - New Orleans traded up in the second round of the 2019 NFL Draft to select this standout from Texas A&M, who was a three-year starter, anchoring the middle of the Aggies line. In 2018, he was a team captain who paved the way for the SEC's leading rusher and in 2019 was the first Saint in franchise history to start at center in Week One, opening all 16 contests. McCoy has opened all 67 contests he has appeared in at center and signed a five-year contract extension with the team in 2022.

G/C Cesar Ruiz - The hard-working, talented and intelligent lineman is a perfect fit for New Orleans' culture. He was selected with the 24th pick in the 2020 NFL Draft out of the University of Michigan. The three-year letterman played in 36 games in college, starting his last 31 including the final 26 at center, earning All-Big Ten in 2019. Ruiz settled in at right guard in the last 15 games, with nine starts, as well as both postseason contests. When McCoy suffered a lower leg injury in the first quarter of the 2021 opening win over Green Bay, Ruiz transitioned over to his natural position, where the Saints did not give up a sack in his four starts at center. He returned to right guard on Oct. 25 at Seattle and was the only lineman in 2021 to not miss a start. Ruiz opened 13 games at right guard and one at center in 2022 before suffering a season-ending foot injury Dec. 18, vs. Atlanta. The 46 consecutive starts for Ruiz at the time of his injury was the longest active streak for a Saint. Following an ardent rehab, Ruiz returned to the starting lineup for the season opener on September 10, the day after signing a four-year contract extension.

T Landon Young - A mainstay at left tackle for his college career at Kentucky, Young played in 49 contests with 30 starts in his college career. The Lexington, Ky. native was selected by New Orleans in the sixth round of the 2021 NFL Draft and held up to the competition in training camp to snare a roster spot. Young opened one contest at right tackle in 2021 and serves as Ramczyk's backup on the right side, also playing jumbo tight end. In 2022, Young showed versatility. On October 13 at Pittsburgh, he slide over to left tackle for the second half to replace Hurst (concussion) and opened this the November 20 win over the Rams at one of the league's most challenging positions. In the January 1, 2023 win at Philadelphia, Young played the final three quarters in place of Ramczyk (hip) and then started the following week's finale vs. Carolina.

T Trevor Penning - The club's second first round draft choice (19th overall) in 2022 out of Northern Iowa, the 6-7, 322-pound Penning competed with Hurst for the starting left tackle slot in the preseason before suffering a toe injury. The Clear Lake, Iowa native brings athleticism and extensive college experience to the tackle position, where he played in 37 games with 33 starts. Activated for the second half of the season, Penning served as the club's sixth offensive lineman in jumbo packages and started the season finale at left tackle, carrying over in 2023 to see action at the position in six-of-ten contests played.

G/C Max Garcia - The nine-year NFL veteran was signed

as a free agent at the start of training camp. This versatile lineman has played in 115 regular season games with 62 starts for New Orleans, Arizona and Denver, including opening the last three contests at left guard. Originally a fourth round draft pick of Denver out of Florida in 2015, who started five contests as a rookie for the Super Bowl 50 champions, Garcia has opened 46 games at right guard, 12 at left guard and four at center.

After finishing ranked seventh in 2021, surrendering 318.2 net yards per game, the New Orleans defense returned to the top five again in 2022, ranking fifth, while giving up 314.8 net yards per game. New Orleans and San Francisco are the only two teams to rank in the top ten each of the last three seasons and this marked the third time the Saints have ranked in the top ten in total defense for three straight seasons (1982-84 and 1991-93).

A third round draft pick of the Denver Broncos in 2018 out of Boston College, in addition to starting 21 of his 80 career contests on defense and posting 119 tackles, a split sack, two interceptions, 19 passes defended and a forced fumble, **Isaac Yiadom** has recorded 24 career coverage stops for five teams. Brought up to the active roster during Gray's injury, Yiadom brought a boost to the Saints coverage units with three stops, remaining an integral part of the group after Gray's return to the lineup and re-signing in the off-season. In 2023, Yiadom ranks second on the team with four special teams tackles, only two away from his career-high. On Oct. 29, at Indianapolis, Yiadom downed a punt at the Colts three-yard line in the third quarter. In Sunday's win over Chicago, Yiadom played a key role on a punt with the Bears starting field position at their two-yard line.

One of the club's two third round draft picks in 2020, **Zack Baun**, a former Wisconsin standout, has embraced work on the team's special teams units. He has recorded 20 tackles on coverage, one blocked field goal and 54 defensive stops, one interception and one pass defense. On Sept. 10 at Tennessee, Baun got his hands on a punt that went out of bounds one yard past the line of scrimmage, a game-changing play.

Selected in the fifth round of the 2022 NFL Draft by the Saints out of Appalachian State, LB **D'Marco Jackson** came to New Orleans as the only Football Bowl Subdivision player with more than 200 tackles and 25 stops for loss in the 2020 and 2021 seasons combined. After missing his entire rookie campaign with a hamstring injury, Jackson's hard-working and hard-hitting mentality has proven to be a good fit on the team's coverage units as he leads New Orleans with six stops, tying a career-high with two on October 8 at New England.

DB **Lonnie Johnson** was signed by New Orleans as a free agent in the offseason after spending his first three seasons with the Houston Texans and the 2022 campaign with the Tennessee Titans. Johnson has posted 17 career special teams stops, including two with New Orleans in 2023. On Oct. 19, at Jacksonville, Johnson had a fumble recovery off a muffed punt for his first career special teams take-away.

Signed as an undrafted free agent in 2022 out of Utah, Sewell appeared in four games on special teams as a rookie. In 2023, the sure tackler secured a spot on the team's coverage units and is ranked second on the team with five stops to go with one defensive tackle.

The success of the team's coverage units have allowed New Orleans to rank first in the NFC and second in the NFL in opponent punt return average.

QUARTERBACKS

DEREK CARR

• On March 6, 2023 the New Orleans Saints agreed to terms with quarterback Derek Carr on a four-year contract to solidify the team's quarterback position. He spent the first nine seasons of his National Football League career with the Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders. Originally selected in the second round (36th overall) of the 2014 NFL Draft by the Raiders out of Fresno State, the Bakersfield, Calif. na-

tive has started all 152 career regular season games he has played in, completing 3,421-of-5,292 passes (64.6 percent) for 37,453 yards with 227 touchdown passes, 103 interceptions and a 91.6 passer rating, while adding 878 rushing yards and six touchdowns. From 2014-22 as a member of the Raiders, Carr was selected to four Pro Bowl Games (2015-17, 2022) and set numerous team passing records including the franchise's career passing yardage and touchdown pass marks and single-season mark in passing yards (4,804 in 2021), as the only signal-caller in the team's history with multiple seasons reaching the 4,000 yard mark. He also holds franchise records from his Raiders tenure for multiple-touchdown pass games (69), contests with a passer rating of at least 100.0 (47) and 300-yard passing performances (33).

• Since entering the league in 2014, Carr ranks third in the NFL in completions, fourth in passing yardage and seventh in passing touchdowns. He became the third quarterback in history to pass for 3,000-plus yards in each of his first nine seasons, joining Pro Football Hall of Fame signal-caller Peyton Manning and Russell Wilson. He is just the fourth player in NFL history to reach 35,000 passing yards in his first nine seasons. He has completed 292 passes of 25+ yards since he entered the league in 2014, the fourth-most in the NFL over that span. His 152 starts are the most by a quarterback since 2014.

• Carr enjoyed a successful Saints debut in the Sept. 10 win over Tennessee, when he completed 23-of-33 passes (69.7%) for 305 yards with one touchdown, one interception and a 96.1 passer rating.

• Carr helped lead New Orleans to a 20-17 victory at Carolina on Monday Night Football on Sept. 18, when in the second half, he completed a 42-yard pass to Chris Olave and a 45-yard pass to Rashid Shaheed to set up the Saints' two touchdowns.

• On Sept. 24 at Green Bay, Carr had completed 13-of-18 (72.2%) of his passes for 103 yards with an eight-yard scoring throw to TE Jimmy Graham and a 104.6 passer rating to help put New Orleans ahead 17-0 over the Packers before being forced to leave in the third quarter with a sprained AC joint injury.

• Carr was a model of efficiency in the Oct. 8 34-0 shutout of New England, completing 18-of-26 passes (69.2%) for 183 yards with two touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 114.7 passer rating, his highest as a Saint to date.

• On Oct. 15 at Houston, Carr finished 32-of-50 passing (64.0 pct.) for 353 yards, one touchdown and one interception, also carrying two yards for a first down. It was the tenth-highest passing yardage total of Carr's career and his highest total as a Saint to date.

QUARTERBACKS

• On Oct. 19 vs. Jacksonville, Carr completed 33-of-55 passes for 301 yards with a 17-yard touchdown pass to WR Michael Thomas, as he became the first Saints passer to have back-to-back weeks of at least 300 yards passing since Drew Brees in Weeks 14 and 15 of the 2019 campaign.

• In the Oct. 29 win at Indianapolis, Carr was in complete control, as he completed 19-of-27 passes for 310 yards with two touchdowns, including a 58-yard touchdown pass to Shaheed, one of two completions of 50-yards or more to the second-year speedster, as he became the first Saints passer to have three consecutive weeks of at least 300 yards passing since Brees did so in four straight from Dec. 21, 2015-Sept. 11, 2016. It was also the first time Carr threw for 300 yards in three straight contests since Weeks One-Three of the 2021 campaign.

• In the Nov. 5 24-17 win over Chicago, Carr completed 25-of-34 passes (73.5) for 211 yards, two touchdowns and a 108.8 passer rating. Carr engineered a fourth quarter, go-ahead, game-winning drive, where he completed both passing attempts for 18 yards, a drive which contributed to putting New Orleans in sole possession of first place in the NFC South.

- The 2013 Heisman Trophy winner at Florida State and the first pick in the 2015 NFL Draft, Winston has appeared in 90 games with 80 starts, completing 1,761-of-2,877 passes (61.2%) for 22,063 yards with 141 touchdowns, 99 interceptions and an 87.0 rating, adding 1,216 rushing yards and 11 touchdowns. In 2021, before suffering a season-ending knee injury in Week Eight, Winston completed 95-of-161 passes for 1,170 yards, 14 touchdowns, three interceptions and a 102.8 passer rating, ranked first in the NFL at the time of his injury in touchdown percentage (8.7).
- Serving as the backup to Carr with extensive starting experience, Winston has completed 23-of-42 passes for 223 yards with two touchdowns and three interceptions.

TAYSOM HILL

- Hill's brought unheralded versatility to the Saints offense and special teams. A constant participant on special teams from midseason in 2017, as well as the backup signal-caller and as a runner and receiver, Hill has played in 91 regular season games with 40 starts at several positions. He has carried 367 times for 2,019 yards with 26 touchdowns, caught 65 passes for 634 yards with ten touchdowns, completed 190-of-293 passes (64.8%) for 2,337 yards with 11 touchdowns, returned 18 punts for 429 yards, made 14 special teams tackles and one blocked punt.
- In 2022, Hill assisted the Black and Gold offense in multiple facets. He contributed on both offense and special teams in the season opener at Atlanta, Hill carried four times for a club-best 81 yards (20.3 avg.), including a career-long 57-yard carry, as well as an 11-yard rushing touchdown on the same first quarter drive of his long run. Hill also caught a pass for a two-yard gain and contributed on multiple special teams units both on the coverage and return teams. Overall, he ranked second on the team in rushing with 96 carries for a career-high 575 yards (club-best 6.0 avg.) with a club-best seven rushing touchdowns, nine catches for 75 yards with two scores, leading the team in total touchdowns, while completing 13-of-19 passes for 240 yards with two touchdown throws and a 146.3 passer rating.

• In 2023, Hill has carried 50 times for 261 yards (5.2 avg.), with a team-high three rushing touchdowns. He has caught a career-high 22 passes for 159 yards with one touchdown and completed five-of-six passing attempts for 72 yards with one touchdown, while adding one special teams tackle.

RENAISSANCE MAN

Hill enjoyed an all-around standout versatile performance in Sunday’s win over Chicago, when he led the team in rushing, carrying 11 times for 52 yards (4.7 avg.), completed a three-yard touchdown pass to TE Juwan Johnson and caught four passes for 13 yards with one touchdown. With his touchdown reception from Carr, the tenth of his career, Hill became the first player since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger and the first player since QB/HB Frank Gifford to have at least ten career rushing touchdowns, passing touchdowns and receiving touchdowns. Hill has 26 rushing touchdowns, 11 touchdown passes and ten touchdowns in his career and became the second player in NFL history with at least 25 rushing touchdowns, ten touchdown passes and ten touchdown receptions, joining Gifford (34 rushing touchdowns, 14 touchdown passes and 43 touchdown receptions). Given the historical element of Hill’s accomplishments, the Pro Football Hall of Fame has requested several items that were worn and used by Hill in his historic performance for exhibit to fans.

• A talented runner and receiver with a 5-10, 215-pound frame who was selected by the Saints in the third round of the 2017 NFL Draft out of the University of Tennessee, Kamara enjoyed an outstanding rookie campaign. He ranked first on the club and sixth in the NFL in yards from scrimmage (1,554), second on the team in rushing and receiving, carrying 120 times for 728 yards (6.1 avg.) with eight TDs and a two-point conversion, catching 81 passes for 826 yards (10.2 avg.) with five TDs and a kickoff return for a TD for a club rookie record 14 total scores, tied for second in the NFL. Kamara finished first in the NFL in yards per carry.

•Kamara was the first Saints offensive rookie selected to the Pro Bowl since Rueben Mayes (1986), as an AP second team All-Pro (flex), the clubs’ first rookie All-Pro since 1993. He was named *The Sporting News* NFL Rookie of the Year and AP NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year.

•In seven games in 2023, Kamara leads New Orleans in rushing with 104 carries for 388 yards and two touchdowns, leading NFL running backs in receiving with 50 receptions

for 305 yards with one touchdown for a club-best 693 total yards from scrimmage.

JAMAAL WILLIAMS

- Signed by the Saints as an unrestricted free agent from Detroit in the offseason, Williams is a talented runner who had a breakout season in 2022, as he led the National Football League and set a Lions single-season franchise record for rushing touchdowns with 17. In 17 games with nine starts for Detroit, Williams added on 262 attempts for 1,066 rushing yards and 12 receptions for 73 yards, producing the first 1,000 yard rushing season of his career.

- The former BYU star's talent came consistently all over the field, as well as in short bursts, as ten of his rushing touchdowns in 2022 came from exactly one yard out, tied for third-most in NFL history. A sound ballcarrier, he went 752 career touches before fumbling the ball and became the league's first active running back to reach 600 carries before fumbling.

- Since being drafted by Green Bay in the fourth round (134th overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft, Williams has played in 96 games with 42 starts, totaling 960 attempts for 3,783 yards and 30 touchdowns, while adding 166 receptions for 1,215 yards and eight touchdowns against only five fumbles.

• A talented wide receiver who became one of the most prolific receivers in Buckeyes history, Olave played in 47 games and caught 176 passes for 2,711 yards (15.4 avg.) with 35 touchdowns. Olave's 35 career touchdown receptions set an Ohio State program record and ranks fourth in Big Ten history. His 11 career 100-yard games also ranks second in school history. Olave entered the starting lineup in 2019 with immediate results. He helped lead the Buckeyes to three consecutive Big Ten championships (2018-2020) and back-to-back College Football Playoff appearances (2019, 2020). In the 2020 CFP Semifinal vs. Clemson, Olave had a career night, hauling in six passes for 132 yards and two touchdowns in a 49-28 win, securing a bid to play in the championship game. Olave seamlessly integrated into the Saints offense following a standout senior campaign, where he caught 65 passes for 936 yards (14.4 avg.) and 13 touchdowns, tied for sixth nationally, as he was selected as an AFCA first-team All-American and a consensus second-team All-American.

• Following a September, where he captured NFL Offensive Rookie of the Month honors with 17 grabs for a league rookie-best 268 yards, including scoring receiving touchdowns in back to back contests, Olave led the team in receiving, yards per catch and receiving yardage with 72 grabs for 1,042 yards (14.5 avg.) with four touchdowns along with a successful two-point conversion, ranking second among rookies in receiving yardage and tied for second in catches and third down grabs (26). Olave became the first Saints rookie since Danny Abramowicz (1967) to lead the team in receiving, receiving yardage and yards per catch in his first campaign. The receiving yardage total was second all-time among Saints rookies, as he was only the third Black and Gold rookie to reach 1,000.

Chris Olave became the 24th player since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger to record 1,000 receiving yards in his rookie season in 2022, recording 1,042.

Olave has picked up right where he left off from his rookie campaign in 2023, as he leads the team in receiving and receiving yardage with 56 receptions for 657 yards (11.7 avg.) with three touchdowns, tied for the team lead.

MICHAEL THOMAS

• A talented wideout with a 6-3, 212-pound frame who was selected by the Saints in the second round of the 2016 NFL Draft out of Ohio State, Thomas had an outstanding rookie campaign, leading the team with 92 receptions for 1,137 yards and a nine touchdowns. He became the first Saints rookie to break 1,000 yards since Marques Colston (1,038-2006). In 2017, Thomas was New Orleans' receiving leader, making a then-club-record 104 receptions for 1,245 yards with five TDs to rank third in the league and making him only the second player in NFL record books, joining Odell Beckham Jr. to have 90 catches in each of his first two seasons, his 196 grabs being the most by a player in his first two seasons.

After being sidelined for all but three games in 2022 with a toe injury that required surgery, Thomas has had a successful return to the field in 2023, playing in all nine games and ranking third on the team in receiving with 39 receptions for 448 yards with one touchdown.

TIGHT ENDS

JUWAN JOHNSON

- The former Penn State and Oregon wideout joined the Saints in 2020 following the NFL Draft and transitioned to tight end his second season. In 2022, the New Jersey native had a breakout campaign as he appeared in 16 games with 12 starts and finished with 42 receptions for 508 yards and a team-best seven touchdown grabs. Johnson's touchdown grab total was tied for third among National Football League tight ends.

- In six games in 2023, Johnson has 14 receptions for 97 yards with one touchdown to lead the tight end corps in receiving. After missing four contests with a calf injury, Johnson's returned to action Oct. 29 and has been an asset as a receiver and a blocker.

FOSTER MOREAU

- This veteran tight end and New Orleans native enters his fifth National Football League season and first with the Black and Gold after spending his first four seasons with the Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders. In his career, Moreau has appeared in 69 regular season games with 39 starts and has recorded 102 receptions for 1,222 yards (12.0 avg.) with 13 touchdowns and has posted at least 30 catches in each of his last two campaigns. In 2022, the former Jesuit High School and LSU standout set career-highs in receptions (33) and receiving yards (420), while adding two touchdowns.

- Moreau got on the scoreboard for the first time as a Saint on Oct. 8 at New England with a fourth quarter six-yard grab. He has 11 grabs for 115 yards to lead the tight ends corps in receiving yardage.

JIMMY GRAHAM

- New Orleans' third round draft choice in 2010 after playing four years of basketball and just one year of football at the University of Miami (Fla.). Graham broke out in his second year with the Saints totaling 99 catches for 1,310 yards with 11 touchdowns and went on to lead the team in receiving for four consecutive seasons. Graham's production has been among the top 10 in NFL history at the tight end position in all three major categories: receptions, yards, and receiving touchdowns. Graham posts career totals of 714 receptions, 8,514 yards, and 86 touchdowns. His 86 receiving touchdowns rank 4th all time among NFL tight ends, while his 52 touchdowns as a Saint rank 2nd in franchise history. He and Kansas City's Travis Kelce are the only two tight ends in NFL history to have multiple seasons of 1,200-plus receiving yards and 10- plus receiving touchdowns. Graham returns to New Orleans, the location of his most personal and team success, after playing in seven campaigns with three other teams.

Graham's 86 career touchdown receptions rank fourth among tight ends all-time, his 714 receptions seventh and his 8,514 receiving yards eighth.

• New Orleans' first choice in the 2011 NFL Draft (24th overall) out of California, Jordan enjoyed another standout season in 2022, recording 66 tackles, a club-best 8.5 sacks for a loss of 67.5 yards, a team-high 12 stops for loss and 14 quarterback hits, two passes defended and two forced fumbles to tie for the team lead.

• In 2023, Jordan has started every contest and has recorded 33 tackles (15 solo), two sacks, three passes defended and one fumble recovery for a defense that is ranked in the top ten in the NFL in both opponent net yards per game and opponent points per game.

During this time, the Saints own a 57-23 regular season record when he corrals a signal-caller, and they boast a 24-3 mark in a multi-sack performance in the regular season, including a three-sack performance on Jan. 1, 2023 at Philadelphia that made him the franchise's all-time leader in sacks, the same opponent of his first three-sack performance in 2012. Dec. 24, 2022 at Cleveland, Jordan played in his 200th career game (regular season/postseason combined) in a Black and Gold uniform, moving him into third place on the club's games played list. The following week at Philadelphia, Jan. 1, 2023, Jordan also started his 200th career game, joining Drew Brees as only the second player to start 200 games in Black and Gold uniform. On Sept. 24 at Green Bay, Jordan played in his 206th game, passing P Thomas Morstead for sole possession of second in club record books. On Oct. 29, at Indianapolis, Jordan became only the second Saint, first defensive Saints player and 57th NFL defensive lineman to play in 200 career regular season contests. This past Sunday vs. Chicago, he became only the second Saint to start 200 career regular season. On Sunday at Atlanta, Jordan will appear in his 203rd career regular season contest, moving into a tie for 43rd all-time among league defensive linemen.

VERSATILE DEFENDER

Jordan's the only NFL defender to record at least 300 tackles, 60 sacks, 75 stops for loss and 90 quarterback hits since 2017. Since 2017, Jordan has posted 373 stops, 71 sacks, 88 tackles for loss and 130 quarterback hits.

FOUR IN A ROW

Jordan's had three consecutive contests of at least one sack in 2013, 2014, 2016, 2017-19 and 2021-22. With at least one sack in the final four contests of 2021, Jordan did so twice in a season for the first time. In the 2021 finale at Atlanta, when Jordan dropped Falcons signal-caller Matt Ryan for the 23rd time, he finished the campaign with least one takedown in four consecutive games for the second time in his career, which matched a stretch from October 6-October 27, 2019. KHALEN SAUNDERS

•Originally selected by the Chiefs in the third round (84th overall) of the 2019 NFL Draft out of Western Illinois, Khaleen Saunders enters his fifth NFL season and first with the Saints. The St. Louis, Mo. native has appeared in 47 career regular season games with 14 starts, recording 108 tackles (51 solo), 4.5 sacks, two passes defensed and three stops for loss. The fifth-year pro has also appeared in six postseason contests, posting eight tackles (six solo) and one sack as a member of Kansas City's Super Bowl LIV and LVII Championship teams. Saunders comes to the Saints after turning in his most productive season as a pro in 2022, setting career highs in games played (16), tackles (48), sacks (3.5) and stops for loss (three).

• In 2023, Saunders has started every contest and has recorded 29 tackles for a defense that is ranked in the top ten in the NFL in opponent net yards per game and opponent points per game. Adding value, he has served as a fullback on offense on goal line packages.

LINEBACKERS

DEMARIO DAVIS

• This dependable and sure-tackling defender joined the New Orleans Saints in 2018 after spending his first six National Football League seasons with the New York Jets and Cleveland Browns. For his career, the Brandon, Miss. native has appeared in 187 career regular season games with 173 starts for the Jets (2012-15, 2017), Cleveland (2016) and the Saints (2018-), recording 1,287 stops (831 solo), 40 sacks, three interceptions, 54 passes defended, four forced fumbles, seven fumble recoveries and 24 special teams tackles. With a club-best seven stops on Jan. 1, 2023 at Philadelphia, Davis joined Bobby Wagner and Lavonte David as only the third active NFL player with 1,200 stops.

• In 2018, Davis opened all 16 contests and led the team with 110 stops (74 solo), five sacks to lead the linebackers, four passes defended, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. Davis' abilities to diagnose and tackle played a key role in New Orleans ranking *second in the* NFL in opponent rushing yards per game and opponent rushing yards per play. Participating in the postseason for the first time, Davis led the defense with 22 stops (15 solo), an interception in the NFC Championship and a pass defense.

• In 2019, he posted 111 stops, ranked first on the club, four sacks, one interception and 11 passes defended to help spur the league's fourth-ranked run defense.

IRON MAN

Davis who had never missed a game in his career until December 27, 2021 vs. Miami due to COVID-19 protocols, ranks as one of the league’s most durable defenders, while playing one of the game’s most physically demanding positions. His 158 consecutive games played streak was the longest in the NFL by a position player and his 79 straight games started were the most at his position. In 2022, Davis was one of three Black and Gold starting defenders to open every contest, joining safety Tyrann Mathieu and defensive tackle David Onyemata. More impressive, he was the only linebacker in the NFL to play in every defensive snap for his teams.

PETE WERNER

- New Orleans selected this three-year starter from Ohio State in the second round of the 2021 NFL Draft. The Indianapolis native finished his college career playing in 47 career games with 35 starts, recording 185 tackles (111 solo), 16 stops for loss, four sacks, 11 passes defended, four forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Werner helped power the Buckeyes to the College Football Playoff championship game as a senior in 2020, when he was voted by Big Ten coaches as a first-team All-Conference selection and a Butkus Award semifinalist, posting 54 tackles, 2.5 stops for loss, one sack and two forced fumbles. Werner made his second career start Oct. 3 vs. the Giants and recorded a ten tackles. With 13 stops in Week Five at Washington, he became the first Saints rookie defender to reach double-digit totals in back-to-back games. He ranked fifth on the team with 59 tackles.

- Werner enjoyed a standout 2022 season, appearing in 12 games with 11 starts at weakside linebacker and ranked third on the team and second at the linebacker position, despite missing five games, with 79 tackles (55 solo), three stop for loss, three passes defended, two forced fumbles and one special teams tackle.

- Werner got off to an impressive start for the 2023 season, finishing second on the team with eight stops in the Sept. 10 season-opening win over Tennessee, one stop for loss and a split sack, his first career takedown. He recorded his first career interception this on October 8 in a 34-0 shutout at New England. Leading or tying for the team lead in stops in the last three contests, Werner is ranked second on the team with 59 stops, a split sack, one interception, one pass defense and a fumble recovery, which took place late in the fourth quarter November 5 to preserve a 24-17 win over Chicago.

SECONDARY

S TYRANN MATHIEU

- This versatile, hard-hitting, playmaking safety and New Orleans native returned home, signing after the draft and brings extensive experience to the secondary. Mathieu was selected by the Arizona Cardinals in the third round (69th overall) in the 2013 NFL Draft out of LSU and has played for the Cardinals (2013-17), Houston Texans (2018), Kansas City Chiefs (2019-21) and now the Saints. In 11 NFL seasons, he has played in 156 regular season games with 147 starts and has posted career totals of 742 tackles (613 solo), 42 stops for loss, ten sacks for a loss of 78 yards, 30 interceptions for 406 returns yards, four brought back for touchdowns, 94 passes defended, four forced fumbles, seven fumble recoveries and five special teams stops. Mathieu has been selected to three Pro Bowls, three Associated Press All-Pro teams and the Pro Football Hall of Fame’s 2010’s All-Decade Team.

NOSE FOR THE BALL

Mathieu came to New Orleans after starting all 16 games he played in for Kansas City in 2021 and recording 76 tackles, one sack, a career-high three fumble recoveries, one sack and two interceptions to earn his second consecutive Pro Bowl selection. With a team-leading three picks and one fumble recovery, adding up to a team-best four takeaways to go with a career-high 91 tackles (club-best 64 solo) to rank third on the team and first in the secondary.

Mathieu’s 30 picks since coming into the league in 2013 are tied for fourth in the NFL.

CB MARSHON LATTIMORE

.• Selected by the Saints in the first round (11th overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft, Lattimore started all 13 games he appeared in. He totaled 53 tackles (44 solo), a forced fumble, one fumble recovery, five interceptions for 85 yards and 18 passes defended, as he became the youngest Saint (21 years old) ever selected to the Pro Bowl and was selected as the AP NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year.

• In 2018, Lattimore opened all 16 contests and posted a career-high 59 tackles (49 solo), two interceptions, 12 passes defended, a club-best four forced fumbles (tied for fourth in the NFL) and three fumble recoveries returned for 91 yards, leading the team in takeaways and tied for the NFL lead in defensive fumble recoveries, the highest total among defensive backs.

• A standout 2019 campaign by Lattimore resulted in him being voted to the Pro Bowl, the only Saints cornerback to ever be selected multiple times. Lattimore started all 14 games he played in and posted 57 stops, one interception and ranked first on the team with 14 passes defended.

.• In 2020, he posted a career-high 62 tackles (52 solo), two interceptions and 11 passes defended as he was voted to the Pro Bowl for the third time.

.• After signing a contract extension in 2021, Lattimore continued to fulfill high expectations as he posted 68 stops, three picks, a career-high 19 passes defended, ranked third in the NFL and one fumble recovery, being selected to his fourth Pro Bowl.

.• After missing ten games (abdomen) in 2022, Lattimore returned to action Jan. 1, 2023 at Philadelphia and made an instant impact, tying for the team lead with six solo tackles, a team-high two passes defended and returning an interception 12 yards for a touchdown for New Orleans' first defensive score of the season. He started all seven games he appeared in and posted 21 stops, the pick for a score and four passes defended.

.• To open 2023, Lattimore came up with a standout performance in the season-opening win over Tennessee. In addition to his 15th career pick, to move him into a tie for eighth place in club record books in interceptions, he also had four passes defended, the third time in his career, he has deflected at least four throws in a contest.

GET A HAND ON

CB PAULSON ADEBO

• New Orleans' third round selection (76th overall) in the 2021 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Adebo overcame not playing college football in 2020 to make significant contributions to the Saints secondary in his first season with the club. The Texas native finished his college career playing in 22 games with 21 starts for Stanford and recording 97 tackles, 34 passes defended and eight interceptions, earning All-Pac 12 honors in both 2018 and 2019.

• Adebo showed his development by opening opposite Lattimore in the 2021 regular season opening win vs. Green Bay and returning a pick 33 yards in the third quarter to become the first Saints defender to have an interception in his NFL debut since LB James Allen vs. Tampa Bay on September 8, 2002. He then added a second pick in the Week Five win at Washington. With a pick in the regular season finale at Atlanta, Adebo finished his rookie campaign ranked fifth on the club with 63 tackles (54 solo), tied for first with three picks and added eight passes defended and two special teams stops.

• Adebo fought off injuries in 2022 and played in 13 games with 12 starts to lead the team's corners with 60 tackles (51 solo) and added seven passes defended for the NFL's second-ranked club in opponent passing yards per game.

•Sharpened by an extensive training camp competition, Adebo is enjoying a standout campaign despite missing two contests with a hamstring injury. Following a two interception, three total takeaway performance in The November 5 24-17 win over Chicago that earned him NFC Defensive Player of the Week, Adebo has 36 tackles, four interceptions, 13 passes defended, two forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Adebo's four interceptions are tied for third in the NFL, while his six total takeaways are tied for first in the league with Baltimore Ravens S Geno Stone and Dallas Cowboys S DaRon Bland. • Originally a second round draft pick of the New York Jets in 2017 out of the University of Florida, Maye is a seven-year NFL veteran who has recorded career totals of 397 tackles (285 solo), 4.5 sacks, eight interceptions, 28 passes defended, five forced fumbles and one fumble recovery in 74 career games, all starts. Despite missing five contests in 2022, Maye recorded 60 tackles and one forced fumble. Maye teams with Mathieu for a formidable safety tandem. Additionally, Phillips took part in a 13-day study abroad trip to Vietnam after he was inducted into the 2016-17 VOLeaders Academy Class...Graduated with a degree in Communication Studies.

PERSONAL – Attended Hillsboro (Nashville, Tenn.) HS, where as a senior he recorded 58 tackles (22.5 for loss) with 13 sacks and was named All-Midstate as well as one of *The Tennessean*...Four-star recruit and played in the 2015 All-American Bowl...Mother, Theresa, served as athletic director of Tennessee State from 2002-19, previously serving as their women's basketball coach from 1989-2000 after a playing career at Vanderbilt...In his time with Jets, Was selected by the Jets equipment staff as the 2019 Bill Hampton Award winner, which is given annually to a Jets rookie who displays the most friendly, courteous, and neat behavior in the locker room.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR

- If the Saints defeat the Falcons, they would improve to 6-5 on the season and remain in first place in the NFC South, improving their mark in division contests to 2-1.
- A Saints win would improve New Orleans' regular season record against Atlanta to 55-53.
- A Saints win would improve New Orleans' road record in 2023 to 4-3.
- A Saints would extend New Orleans' winning streak against Atlanta to four games, dating back to a 30-20 win on January 9, 2022 and their win streak in contests played at Mercedes-Benz Stadium to six, dating back to a 43-37 overtime victory on September 23, 2018.
- DE Cameron Jordan will play in his 203rd regular season game on Sunday and will move into a tie for 43rd all-time among NFL defensive linemen with Ken Clarke, Richard Dent and former Saints teammate Kevin Williams.
- Jordan's 27 multi-sack games are tied for first in franchise record books with LB Rickey Jackson, needing one more to become the franchise's all-time leader. His six three-sack games are tied for first in club history with Jackson, needing one more to become the leader in that category.
- Jordan has sacked 47 different players in his career. With a sack of Atlanta QB Desmond Ridder, he will have dropped 48 players for a takedown.
- QB Derek Carr has 227 career touchdown passes, tied for 35th all-time with Jay Cutler. With his next touchdown pass, Carr would take sole possession of 35th.
- LB Demario Davis has 1,287 career tackles, needing 13 stops to join Seattle Seahawks LB Bobby Wagner and Tampa Bay Buccaneers LB Lavonte David as only the third active player with 1,300 tackles.
- DE Carl Granderson has 5.5 sacks, tying his career-high from 2022. With a split sack, he would set a new career-best.
- QB Taysom Hill has 2,019 career rushing yards, the second-highest total by a non-running back Saint. With 40 rushing yards, he would surpass QB Archie Manning for the most rushing yards by a Saint who did not play running back.
- Hill has 26 career rushing touchdowns, ranked eighth in club record books. With one rushing touchdown, Hill would move into a tie with RB Tony Galbreath for sixth place and with two, would move into a tie for fifth with RBs Chuck Muncie and Pierre Thomas.
- RB Alvin Kamara has 9,581 total yards from scrimmage, ranked second in club record books. He is 186 yards from surpassing WR Marques Colston (9,766) for the franchise's lead.
- Kamara's 51 career rushing touchdowns are second in franchise history. With one rushing touchdown, he would tie RB Mark Ingram II for first and with two, would become the team's new recordholder.
- Kamara's 51 rushing touchdowns are tied with RBs Neal Anderson, Jonathan Stewart and Greg Bell and FB Mike Pruitt for 77th all-time. With one rushing touchdown, in addition to moving into the tie for first in club records, he would move into a tie for 74th with RBs Emerson Boozer, Chris Warren and FB Bill Brown. With two touchdowns on the ground, in addition to becoming the club's recordholder, he would move into a tie for 71st with RBs Marion Barber, Chuck Foreman and Joe Perry.
- Kamara's seven career games with double-digit reception totals are tied for second all-time in NFL record books with the Los Angeles Chargers' Austin Ekeler for running backs. With double-digit receptions in his next contest, he would take sole possession of second (Ekeler and the Chargers play the Baltimore Ravens on Sunday Night Football).
- Kamara is tied with Pro Football Hall of Fame RB Jim Brown for fifth-all-time with 11 games with both a rushing and receiving touchdown. A performance with a rushing and receiving touchdown would move him into a tie for third with RB Brian Westbrook and Pro Football Hall of Fame flanker/HB Lenny Moore.
- Kamara's three two-point conversions in 2023 is tied with multiple players for second all-time in NFL record books in a single season, having done so previously in 2018, tied for the team record with former Black and Gold RB Reggie Bush (2007). With his next two-point conversion, Kamara would set the club single-season record, as well as being tied with former Baltimore Ravens TE Todd Heap (2003) for the most two-point conversions in a season.
- Kamara's seven career two-point conversions is tied for first in NFL record books with Pro Football Hall of Fame RB and New Orleans native Marshall Faulk. With his next two-point conversion, Kamara would become the league's all-time recordholder.
- S Tyrann Mathieu has 741 career tackles, needing nine stops to reach 750 for his career.
- G/C Cesar Ruiz will start his 50th career game on Sunday.
- LS Zach Wood will play in his 109th career game, moving into a tie for 37th on the club's games played list with CB Fred Thomas and T Dave Lafary.

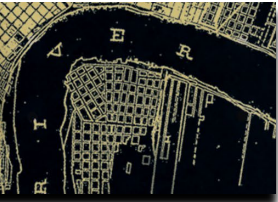
