**THE MATCHUP**

Fresh off a 27-20 victory over the Los Angeles Rams, the New Orleans Saints have another NFC West battle Sunday, when they travel to the San Francisco 49ers.

New Orleans got back into the win column last week after two straight losses to the Baltimore Ravens and the Pittsburgh Steelers. QB Andy Dalton bounced back Sunday, completing 21-of-25 passes for 260 yards and three touchdowns. As an offense, New Orleans eclipsed 300 yards for the first time in November.

TE Taysom Hill got more involved as well, carrying the ball nine times for 52 yards, catching a pass and completing one. Hill's involvement with the offense has paid dividends: The BYU product has rushed for over 50 yards four times this season — the Saints won all four games.

Rookie WR Chris Olave continued his successful campaign, catching five passes for 102 yards and a career-long 53-yard touchdown grab. Olave has now gone over 100 yards three times, and he leads all NFL rookies in catches and receiving yards.

TE Juwan Johnson built on his career season, catching his career-high fifth receiving touchdown, tied for second

among NFL tight ends, on a three-grab, 47-yard performance.

Dalton and company will face a challenge Sunday, as the 49ers rank first in the NFL in total defense (283.9 ypg.) and fourth in opponent points per game (17.3 ppg.).

The vaunted San Francisco defense is strong against the run, allowing a league low 3.4 yards per carry and a league low 81.1 rushing yards per game. Meanwhile, the Saints average 4.7 yards per carry, and RB Alvin Kamara leads the team with 511 yards on the ground and is second on the team with 385 receiving yards.

The 49ers have faced their shares of ups-and-downs this season. Their 2021 first-round pick Trey Lance entered the season as the starting quarterback, but suffered a season-ending injury in Week Two. Veteran Jimmy Garoppolo has started the last eight games. Garoppolo has led San Francisco to a 5-3 record, completing 67.0% of his passes for 2,159 yards and 15 touchdowns to four interceptions with a 104.1 passer rating.

The 49ers traded for RB Christian McCaffrey in October. In his three games with San Francisco, he's tallied 209 rushing yards, four rushing touchdowns, 185 receiving yards and a receiving touchdown.

SERIES HISTORY

Foes in the old NFC West from 1970-2001, the New Orleans Saints and the San Francisco 49ers have an extensive regular season history in addition to playing one of the most thrilling games in NFL playoff history. While San Francisco leads the regular season series 48-27-2, New Orleans has captured seven of the last ten regular season meetings. The first meeting between the two clubs was a 27-13 Saints loss on October 22, 1967 in San Francisco's Kezar Stadium during New Orleans' inaugural season. The last meeting was a 27-13 Saints win at the Superdome on November 15, 2020.

In the 77 regular season games of the series there has been:

- Two seven-game San Francisco winning streaks from 1974-77 and from 1996-99.
- A six-game regular season winning streak for New Orleans from 2002-10.
- A 12-22-2 record for the Saints in regular season road contests, including a 41-23 win on November 6, 2016 in their first game at Levi's Stadium.
- 36 games decided by double-digits.
- 12 games decided by 21-or-more points.
- 38 games decided by a touchdown or less.

LAST MEETING

New Orleans Saints 27, San Francisco 49ers 13, November 15, 2020 at Mercedes-Benz Superdome- With franchise quarterback Drew Brees sidelined by a rib injury, the New Orleans Saints turned to their defense to defeat the San Francisco 49ers 27-13 in front of 6,000 fans at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome on Sunday, Nov. 15.

The defense delivered.

All-Pro linebacker Demario Davis notched a game high 12 tackles, while cornerback C.J. Gardner-Johnson tallied eight total tackles, including his first career sack. Defensive backs Malcolm Jenkins and Patrick Robinson each intercepted San Francisco quarterback Nick Mullens.

Special teams played a factor in the field position game for New Orleans.

Undrafted rookie Marquez Callaway came up with two muffed punt recoveries, and rookie linebacker Zack Baun also delivered a high-impact special teams tackle. It took the Saints offense while to get going, but a 75-yard Deonte Harris kick return sparked the first score of the game, a 49-yard Wil Lutz field goal.

Brees completed 8-of-13 passes for 76 yards and one score before exiting the game with a rib injury at halftime. He took a hard hit in the second quarter on a sack by 49ers defensive end Kentavious Street. Street was called for unnecessary roughness on the play.

"He took a heavy shot in the first half," Saints Coach Sean Payton said during his postgame press conference. "As he came out in the second half, he felt it was really impacting him. He'll get an MRI and x-rays. His back felt sore. As he tried to throw, he just came up to me and said, 'Hey, I don't feel like I'm capable of playing.' And so quickly we made the switch, and you know, that happens sometimes."

"I was not going to be able to be effective," Brees said. "It had nothing to do with pain. It was definitely just what my body was going to be able to do or not be able to do."

Jameis Winston's first pass replacing Brees went for a first down. Winston completed 6-of-10 passes for 63 yards, while Taysom Hill carried the ball eight times for 45 yards from the quarterback position.

"My main job is to serve my teammates and help put us in a position to win the football game," Winston said during his postgame press conference. "I am happy we had a great team win today."

Five quarterbacks took at least one snap between the two teams in Sunday's contest.

Saints star running back Alvin Kamara hauled in seven receptions for 83 yards and a score and added two short rushing touchdowns.

In addition to Brees, the Saints had these players leave the game with injuries; Josh Hill, Tre'Quan Smith, Marshon Lattimore and Malcom Brown.

Recovered a blocked punt in the second quarter than led to his second rushing touchdown. First career game with three rushing touchdowns. Completed his lone pass for a 21-yard touchdown. Sunday's contest against Seattle was Hill's first career game with 3+ touchdowns. He's also the first player since the NFL merger to register a kick return, two rushing touchdowns and a passing touchdown in the same game. Hill became the second player in franchise history with at least three rushing touchdowns and a passing touchdown in the same game, joining Archie Manning. Hill's the third player ever to record at least 100 rushing yards, three rushing touchdowns and a touchdown pass in a single game, joining **RONNIE BROWN** (September 21, 2008) and Pro Football Hall of Famer **LADAINIAN TOMLINSON** (September 25, 2005). Hill now has 21 career rushing touchdowns, seven career touchdown receptions and nine career touchdown passes. He joins Tomlinson as the only players since 2000 with at least 20 rushing touchdowns, five receiving touchdowns and five touchdown passes in their career. With his 20th and 21st career rushing touchdown, Hill joins Walter Payton as only the second player in the Super Bowl era with 20 rushing touchdowns (21), eight passing touchdowns (nine) and six receiving touchdowns (seven). Named NFC Offensive Player of the Week, joining RB Reggie Bush as only the second Saint to win a conference weekly award in multiple phases, having previously won NFC Special Teams Player of the Week (Week 14, 2018).

BUCKING THE ODDS

The Saints have a long tradition of finding players as free agents signed after the draft that make an impact. Several currently on the 53-man roster play key roles.

WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed** came to New Orleans as one of the all-time best Division FCS returners and after spending the first five weeks on the practice squad, made a quick impact, Oct. 16 vs. Cincinnati with a 44-yard rushing touchdown. He followed that up with a 53-yard TD reception on Oct. 20 at Arizona to become the only Saint to score a touchdown in each of his first two offensive touches. Overall, he has carried for a 44-yard TD, caught six passes for 111 yards with a TD, returned ten punts for 97 yards (9.7 avg.) and returned eight kickoffs for 169 yards (21.1 avg.).

WR **Marquez Callaway** led the team in 2021 in two of four major receiving categories with a club-best 46 receptions for a team-high 698 yards (15.2 avg., ranked tenth in the NFL) and a club-best six TD grabs as the team's only offensive skill player to play in all 17 games. In 2022, Callaway has 16 grabs for 158 yards and has returned four punts for 25 yards.

DE **Carl Granderson** played in 15 games in 2021 with three starts and posted 24 tackles and three sacks. In 2022, he has posted 29 stops (14 solo) and 2.5 sacks after posting a career-high seven stops and 1.5 takedowns in Sunday's win over the Los Angeles Rams.

Punter **Blake Gillikin** enjoyed an October, 2021 where he was selected as NFC Special Teams Player of the Month. He finished his first season in 2021 with punting duties ranked third in the league with 29 punts dropped inside the 20-yard line. In 2022, he has a 42.9 net average with 17 dropped inside the 20.

LB **Nephi Sewell** was signed after the 2022 NFL Draft out of Utah. After leading New Orleans with 12 tackles in the preseason, he started the campaign on the practice squad before making his NFL regular season playing debut last November 12 at Pittsburgh.

Offensive Lineman **Calvin Throckmorton** was one of two Saints linemen to play in all 17 games in his second season in 2021, starting four at right guard and the last nine contests at left guard. In 2022, he's started two games at left guard and has seen action at right guard and left guard the last three contests, opening Sunday's win over the Los Angeles Rams at left guard.

DT **Shy Tuttle** joined the club in 2019 as an undrafted free agent and has played in 55 regular season games with 26 starts, posting 54 tackles, two sacks, one interception, eight passes defended, one forced fumble and one recovery for one of the league's top run defenses. 13.5 – With a sack against Carolina on Sept. 25, Jordan now has 13.5 career sacks against the Panthers and double-digit totals against all three NFC South division opponents.

15 – With one sack against Tampa Bay on October 31, 2021, Jordan became the 15th National Football League player with at least 15 takedowns against two different teams. Jordan has 17 sacks against the Buccaneers, the second-most against an opponent.

15.5 – 2019 Sack total by Jordan, ranked third in the National Football League. It is tied for the fourth-highest total in franchise history.

4 – Consecutive opponents, the Saints will play with a .500 record or better in 2021 from November 13-December 5, three on the road. The Saints started the stretch at Pittsburgh (9-7-1) on November 13, host the defending Super Bowl Champion Los Angeles Rams (12-5) on Sunday, play at the San Francisco 49ers (10-7) on Nov. 27 and play at Tampa Bay (13-4) on Monday Night Football on Dec. 5. New Orleans is 1-1 on this stretch with two road games of it remaining the next two weeks before a Week 14 bye.

6 – Road games the Saints are scheduled to play in outdoor stadiums (in Tampa, Carolina, Pittsburgh, San Francisco, Cleveland and Philadelphia), as well as Sunday's loss to the Vikings which was played in London's Tottenham Hotspur Stadium. Arizona's State Farm Stadium and Atlanta's Mercedes-Benz Stadium are retractable roof venues, with the opener in Atlanta played with the roof closed and the Oct. 20 at the Cardinals played with the roof open.

8 – Number of years since the Saints have played the Bengals and Ravens at home and the Steelers and Browns on the Road. In 2014, the Saints lost 26-24 at Cleveland, 27-10 vs. the Bengals, 34-27 to the Ravens on Monday Night Football and beat the Steelers 35-32 at Heinz Field. New Orleans are 1-2 in interconference contests in 2022 with a win over Las Vegas and losses to Baltimore, Cincinnati and Pittsburgh. The Saints will close out interconference play on Christmas eve at Cleveland.

9 – Times the Saints, including this year's season-opening win, have opened the Saints against the Falcons. Also the number of games against 2021 playoff teams in 2022. In addition to their NFC South matchups, the Saints will face

the NFC West (Rams, Cardinals, Seahawks, 49ers) and the AFC North (Steelers, Ravens, Bengals, Browns) in addition to the Eagles, Vikings and Las Vegas Raiders. Playoff opponents include the Buccaneers (2), Bengals, Cardinals, Raiders, Steelers, Rams, 49ers and Eagles.

10 – Number of Saints games that are scheduled to begin at noon CT on Sunday this season. With the date and time of the Week 15 and Week 18 contests to be finalized later in the season, the exceptions are the Oct. 2 8:30 a.m. CT contest vs. the Vikings (2:30 p.m. in London), prime-time contests against the Cardinals, Ravens and Buccaneers and Sunday's 3:25 contest at the 49ers.

PRACTICE MAKES PERFECT

A spot on the practice squad is another avenue to eventually get onto the active roster and have the opportunity to contribute. Below is an overview of players on the club's roster with extensive practice squad experience.

RB **Dwayne Washington** participated on the Saints practice squad briefly in 2018 after spending most of the 2016 and 2017 seasons on Detroit's active roster. Through development, the tailback, in addition to his running skills, has developed into a core special teams player with 11 stops, to have a career-high seven for 2021.

TE **Juwan Johnson** was signed by New Orleans out of Oregon, where he spent his graduate transfer season following the 2020 NFL Draft as a wideout. Recording four receptions for 39 yards seven contests, Johnson spent the majority of the season on the practice squad. Converted to tight end in 2021 and leading the position group with four touchdowns, Johnson's took advantage of his frame and participation in his first full offseason strength and conditioning program in 2022 and leads the tight ends group with 31 receptions for 349 yards with a club-best five touchdown grabs, tied for second in the league at his position. **CONTINUED ON NEXT PAGE**

TEAM NOTES

After spending the last six weeks of the 2019 season and the first 16 weeks of the 2020 campaign on the practice squad, LB **Andrew Dowell** was elevated to the club's active roster for the regular season finale at Carolina. In two pre-season games in 2021, he posted five tackles, one forced fumbles and two coverage spots to secure a regular season roster spot. In Week 3 at New England, Dowell recorded the first blocked punt that an opponent had against the Patriots since the 2015 season. Dowell's five special teams tackles on Dec. 19 at Tampa Bay was the highest single-game total in the NFL in 2021 and he finished the season tied for fifth in the league with 14 coverage stops. On Oct. 16 vs. Cincinnati, he forced a fumble on punt coverage and he posted a tackle at Arizona on October 20.

After splitting his rookie season in 2018 between the practice squad and active roster, defensive back **J.T. Gray** enjoyed a breakthrough campaign in 2019, when he was selected AP second-team All-Pro when he recorded 16 special teams tackles, one blocked punt and one coverage fumble recovery. In 2021, he was selected as a first-team All-Pro and to his first career Pro Bowl (starter), when he led the NFL with 19 special teams tackles (league-leading 16 solo). Gray leads the team with nine special teams stops in 2022, which is tied for fifth in the NFL.

WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed** came to New Orleans as one of the all-time best Division I-AA returners and after spending the first five weeks on the practice squad, made a quick impact on Oct. 16 vs. Cincinnati with a 44-yard rushing touchdown. With his 53-yard receiving touchdown on October 20 at Arizona, Shaheed become the only Saint to score touchdowns on each of his first two career offensive touches. Shaheed has also handled return duties for New Orleans since being activated, bringing back 11 punts for 97 yards (9.7 avg.).

Originally signing as an undrafted free agent with Kansas City in 2014 out of BYU, safety **Daniel Sorensen** spent the first half of his rookie season on the Chiefs practice squad before being elevated to the active roster at midseason where he contributed with seven tackles. Sorensen has played in 118 games with 41 starts, posting 379 tackles, 4.5 sacks, 12 interceptions, four returned for touchdowns, 33 passes defended, four forced fumbles, three fumble recoveries, 35 coverage stops, one special teams fumble recovery and one blocked field goal. Sorensen has one defensive tackle and six special teams stops in 2022

FB **Adam Prentice** was originally signed by the Denver Broncos following the 2021 NFL Draft out of South Carolina. Joining the Saints at the conclusion of the 2021 preseason, Prentice appeared in seven games with three starts for New

Orleans, carrying three times for five yards and catching three passes for 16 yards, while making one special teams stop. In 2022, he has played in five games with one start, catching a pass for a two-yard gain and also contributing on special teams.

Originally signing as an undrafted free agent with Philadelphia in 2014 out of Oregon State, guard/center **Josh Andrews** has had stints on the practice squads of the Eagles early in his career and in New Orleans the first nine weeks of the 2022 campaign, in addition to appearing in 44 career games with six starts at both guard positions and center. Prior to the Week ten contest at Pittsburgh, Andrews was signed to the active roster from the Saints practice squad and has opened the first two contests of his career in the middle of the offensive line in place of an injured Erik McCoy.

Ahead is a synopsis of several returning players and newcomers through the draft and free agency to the 2022 Saints offensive line, which has blocked for the NFL's seventh-ranked rushing offense:

Tackle/Guard James Hurst - An eight-year NFL veteran who was signed as a free agent from Baltimore in 2020, Hurst has 129 career regular season appearances with 74 starts at three different positions on the inside and outside. His versatility came in handy in 2020, as he started two contests at left tackle and one at left guard and the Saints gained over 200 yards rushing each time. In 2021, Hurst moved into the lineup for eight games at left tackle in place of an injured Armstead, two at left guard in place of an in-

jured Andrus Peat and three at right tackle for an injured Ryan Ramczyk, starting contests at three different positions. Hurst has started the first ten games at left tackle before being inactive Sunday vs. the Los Angeles Rams due a concussion.

Right Tackle Ryan Ramczyk - The Black and Gold used their second first round selection in the 2017 NFL Draft to snag Ramczyk out of Wisconsin, one of the best linemen in the entire draft. After opening all 16 games and both post-season contests in 2017 and being selected as a PFWA All-Rookie, he has been selected as an AP All-Pro selection three times since. After missing seven contests in 2021, Ramczyk has rebounded to open every game in 2022.

Center/Guard Josh Andrews - Signed by New Orleans in the 2022 offseason, Andrews has appeared in 44 career NFL games with six starts for five clubs. Spending the first nine weeks on the practice squad, Andrews his first two career starts at center the past two weeks for New Orleans in place of an injured Erik McCoy.

Guard/Center Cesar Ruiz - The hard-working, talented and intelligent lineman is a perfect fit for New Orleans' culture with the 24th pick in the 2020 NFL Draft out of the University of Michigan. The three-year letterman played in 36 games in college, starting his last 31 including the final 26 at center, earning All-Big Ten in 2019. Ruiz settled in at right guard in the last 15 games, with nine starts, as well as both postseason contests. When McCoy suffered a lower leg injury in the first quarter of the 2021 season-opening win over Green Bay, Ruiz transitioned over to his natural position, where the Saints did not give up a sack and started four contests in the middle. He returned to right guard on Oct. 25 at Seattle and was the only lineman in 2021 to not miss a start. The 43 consecutive starts along the offensive line for Ruiz is the longest current streak for a Saint.

Tackle/Guard Andrus Peat - A first round selection (13th overall) in the 2015 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Peat was considered one of the top college linemen in 2014. In his first eight seasons, he's played in 88 regular season games with 83 starts, opening a contest at every position except center. In 2020, he opened 13 contests at left guard as he was part of the NFC Pro squad for the third consecutive season. In 2021, he opened the first six contests, where New Orleans got off to a 4-2 start before suffering a season-ending pectoral injury. In his return to the starting lineup in the 2022 season opener in Atlanta, New Orleans rushed for 151 yards. In back-to-back weeks, Peat was been a part rushing efforts of 200-yards plus by the club for the first time since 2020. Peat has missed the last two contests due to a triceps injury.

Tackle Landon Young - A mainstay at left tackle for his entire college career at the Kentucky, Young played in 49 contests with 30 starts in his college career. The Lexington, Ky. native was selected by New Orleans in the sixth round of the 2021 NFL Draft and held up to the competition in training camp to snare a roster spot. Young opened one contest at right tackle in 2021 and serves as Ramczyk's backup on the right side, also playing jumbo tight end. On October 13 at Pittsburgh, he slide over to left tackle for the second half to replace Hurst (concussion) and opened this past Sunday's win over the Rams at one of the league's most challenging positions.

Offensive Lineman Calvin Throckmorton - This 6-5, 309 pound former four-year starter on the Oregon line was signed as an undrafted free agent in 2020, possessing the flexibility to play all five positions along the offensive line. After spending his rookie season on the practice squad, Throckmorton increased strength in the 2021 offseason and made strides in training camp. In his NFL debut in the 2021 season opening-win, Throckmorton was called to play right guard following a lower leg injury to McCoy in the first quarter, subsequently starting four contests. He then moved into left guard, Oct. 25 at Seattle following a shoulder injury to Andrus Peat and opened the last ten, opening three in 2022 in place of an injured Peat and seeing extensive action in the interior in other contests.

Offensive Lineman Lewis Kidd - This 6-5, 311 pounder closed out his college career with 48 consecutive starts at Montana State, third in school history. Possessing the versatility to play both guard and tackle, he was selected a consensus first-team All-American in the fall of 2021. Kidd was the only Saints undrafted free agent rookie to secure a roster spot in Week One of the regular season and made his first career NFL start, opening at left guard on October 13 at Pittsburgh.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

DEFENSIVE DRAFTS

Over the last eight drafts from 2015-22, the New Orleans Saints have shown a commitment to building up the team's defense, spending 21-of-33 picks on that side of the ball. With nine picks in 2015, the Saints picked six defensive players, the most taken since New Orleans chose nine in a 12-round selection meeting in 1990. Below is an overview of the defensive players selected from 2015-22 with the club:

CB Paulson Adebo, Stanford (D3-21) - Selected in the third round (76th overall) of the 2021 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Adebo finished his college career playing in 22 games with 21 starts and recording 97 tackles, 34 passes defended and eight interceptions, earning All-Pac-12 in 2018 and 2019. He started in the opener and became the first Saint to record an interception in his National Football League debut since 2002. With three picks, he became only the fifth Saints rookie to reach that level. Overall, he posted 63 tackles (54 solo), three picks and eight passes defended. After missing the first two contests of 2022 with an ankle injury, Adebo has posted 41 tackles (37 solo) and four passes defended.

LB Zack Baun, Wisconsin (D3a-20) - Selected in the third round (74th overall) of the 2020 NFL Draft out of the Wisconsin, Baun finished his college career with 154 tackles, 15 sacks, two interceptions, one returned for a TD, six passes defended, three forced fumbles and a recovery. The Saints were attracted to his playmaking ability Baun finished with eight coverage stops in 2021, adding 22 defensive stops (16 solo) and a return of a blocked field goal. In 2022, he has recorded eight coverage stops to rank second on the team and has added four defensive stops.

DE Marcus Davenport, Texas-San Antonio (D1-18) - Davenport joined the Saints with the 14th overall pick in the 2018 NFL Draft after showing potential and production as a pass rusher at Texas-San Antonio. In four seasons, Davenport posted 22 sacks, including 8.5 in 2017 when he captured Conference USA Defensive Player of the Year. Davenport's strength on the line is a valuable asset for the Saints front, as he finished second on the team with a career-high nine sacks and added a club-best three forced fumbles and a fumble recovery in 11 games with nine starts in 2021, despite missing six games.

LB Kaden Elliss, Idaho (D7-19) - New Orleans selected this four-year starter from Idaho to compete at both linebacker and contribute on special teams. The Salt Lake City native finished his college career with 288 stops 47 tackles for loss and 17 sacks. After missing the bulk of his rookie year with a knee injury, Elliss showed promise with five stops on coverage units in 2020 and in 2021, his progress continued with 13 stops, one sack, one fumble recovery and one special teams tackle. In 2022, Elliss has posted a career-high 34 defensive tackles (17 solo), 4.5 sacks, two passes defended, one forced fumble and three special teams stops. He enjoyed his most impressive effort to date when he started on the weakside for an injured Pete Werner on October 13 and posted seven tackles, one sack and one forced fumble. Elliss continued to step up in a more extensive role in place of the injured Werner in Sunday's win over the Los Angeles Rams, where he enjoyed a career afternoon, recording a career-high and team-best ten tackles, a career-best 1.5 sacks, one pass defended and one special teams stop.

Cornerback Marshon Lattimore, Ohio State (D1a-17) -

The 11th overall selection in the 2017 NFL draft out of Ohio State and the first corner taken possesses all the traits of a lockdown defender. With his agile, fluid style, Lattimore has the ability to shut down the best wide receivers. In 2017, he finished with 53 stops, five picks, to lead NFL rookies and the Saints, tying a team rookie record, a club-best 18 passes defended, a forced fumble and a recovery. Lattimore was the first Saints corner selected to the Pro Bowl since 1995 and selected as *AP* Defensive Rookie of the Year. In 2021, he was named the Week Six NFC Defensive Player of the Week, recording a career-high six passes defenses at Washington, the league's highest total since 2017, reaching the Pro Bowl for the fourth time. He finished with 68 tackles (53 solo), three picks, a career-high and league-best 19 passes defended and a fumble recovery to lead the team with four takeaways. The Saints will welcome the return to action of Lattimore soon, as he currently recovers from an abdomen injury.

Defensive Tackle David Onyemata, Manitoba (D4-16) -

Possessing a unique combination of size and speed, this Nigeria native had an impressive rookie year after becoming the first player from the University of Manitoba to be drafted into the NFL. Despite being new to football, the 2016 fourth round draft pick became a critical member on the interior of the Saints defensive front in 2017, playing in all 16 games with six starts, making 40 tackles and two sacks. Overall in his career, he has played in 100 regular season contests with 62 starts, posting 238 career stops, 21.5 sacks for a loss of 144 yards, one interception, six passes defended, one forced fumble and two fumble recoveries. In 2021, Onyemata started all 11 games he played in and posted 34 tackles, two sacks for a loss of 17 yards and one fumble recovery. For the first time in his career, Onyemata has recorded sacks in three consecutive contests in 2022 in three straight weeks, as he has anchored the middle of the defensive line with 22 tackles (14 solo), 3.5 quarterback takedowns, one pass defense and one fumble recovery.

Cornerback Alontae Taylor, Tennessee (D2-22) - A four-year starter at the University of Tennessee, this 6-foot, 193-pound defender possesses a combination of speed, instincts and versatility needed to excel both on defense and special teams. After playing quarterback in high school and starting his college career at wide receiver, he took to the secondary quickly, finishing his college career with totals of 162 tackles (115 solo), a split sack, five stops for loss, three forced fumbles, one fumble recovery for a touch-

down, four interceptions, one returned 56 yards for a touchdown, 17 passes defended and one blocked punt. Taylor has started the last four contests and his six passes defended lead the team to go with 22 tackles (19 solo).

Defensive End Payton Turner, Houston (D1-21) - Selected 28th overall in the first round of the 2021 NFL Draft, the Texas native comes off a senior campaign where he posted 10.5 tackles for loss and five sacks in only five contests. During his four collegiate seasons, Turner notched career totals of 115 tackles (68 solo), ten sacks, 25 tackles for loss, one interception, one forced fumble, ten passes defended and one blocked punt. After having his rookie campaign cut short by a shoulder injury, Turner came back strong in the 2022 season opener at Atlanta with his blocked field goal on the last play of the game securing a dramatic come-from behind 27-26 victory for New Orleans. Oct. 30 vs. Las Vegas, he had his first multiple sack game.

Linebacker Pete Werner, Ohio State (D2-21) - New Orleans selected this three-year starter from Ohio State to compete at the linebacker position. The Indianapolis, Ind. native finished his college career playing in 47 career games with 35 starts, recording 185 tackles (111 solo), 16 stops for loss, four sacks, 11 passes defended, four forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Werner helped power the Buckeyes to the College Football Playoff championship game as a senior in 2020, when he was voted by Big Ten coaches as a first-team All-Conference selection and a Butkus Award semifinalist, posting 54 tackles, 2.5 stops for loss, one sack and two forced fumbles. He finished his rookie campaign with 59 defensive tackles (33 solo) and three special teams stops on the season. In 2022, Werner, currently leads the New Orleans defense with 73 stops (51 solo), a team-leading two forced fumbles, two passes defended and a coverage tackle despite missing the last two contests with an ankle injury.

Defensive Back P.J. Williams, Florida State (D3b-15) - Williams' career was initially limited by missing all but two games his first two seasons, but he's rebounded to miss only four contests with injury since. An experienced starter from Florida State, who developed into one of the nation's top cover corners, in 2019, he made 41 stops, a sack, an interception and three passes defended, serving as the team's nickel corner. In the Dec. 22, 2019 win at Tennessee, Williams further showed his versatility by making the switch to safety after Marcus Williams was forced to depart with a groin injury and then starting in Williams' place in the regular season finale at Carolina. Williams finished tied for the team lead with three picks in 2021 and added 42 tackles (36 solo), two sacks, four passes defended and one forced fumble, playing in 16 games with four starts. In 2022, Williams will play multiple positions in the secondary. On October 13 at Pittsburgh, he opened the game at strong safety in place of an injured Marcus Maye and led the team with a career-high 11 tackles.

The Saints have stopped the run week to week impressively since 2017. In seven straight games in 2018, they didn't

surrender 100 rushing yards to an opponent for the first time since 2007 had a seven-game run in 2020. In 2021, the Saints didn't give up 100 yards rushing in their last four contests. Below are the longest streaks in team history the defense has gone without surrendering 100 yards. Between 2017-20 they didn't allow a 100-yard rusher in a 55 straight games (regular season/postseason), the longest streak in NFL history. After the last streak ended, New Orleans again had the longest current NFL streak of not surrendering a 100-yard rusher until the 2022 season opener when 120 rushing yards were given up to Atlanta running back Cordarelle Patterson. New Orleans gave up a season-low 38 yards rushing in the October 30th 24-0 shutout of the Las Vegas Raiders, the lowest total surrendered since giving up only 34 in Week 9 vs. Atlanta in 2021. The 38 yards were tied for the 24th-lowest single-game total in club history and marked the ninth time that the Saints defense has given up fewer than 40 yards rushing since Allen assumed control of the New Orleans defense in the middle of the 2015 season.

COVERAGE UNITS

New Orleans' coverage and block units in 2022 are led by linebackers **Zack Baun**, **Andrew Dowell**, defensive back **J.T. Gray**, safety **Daniel Sorensen** and running back **Dwayne Washington**.

One of the club's two third round draft picks in 2020, Baun, a former Wisconsin standout, embraced work on the club's coverage units in 2020 with three stops. On Sept. 19 at Carolina, he made an adept play by returning a blocked field goal and was ranked fourth on the team with eight stops. After posting eight stops in 2021, Baun ranks second on the team with eight coverage stops in 2022, while adding four defensive tackles in action at linebacker.

After spending the bulk of the 2019 and 2020 season on the Saints practice squad, Dowell recorded his first career blocked punt on September 26 at New England. He ranked second on the team with 14 stops and was tied for fifth in the NFL after having a career-high five tackles (four solo) on December 19 at Tampa Bay, the highest single-game total in the National Football League in 2021. October 16 vs. Cincinnati, Dowell posted one tackle and a

forced fumble recovered by TE Adam Trautman to set up a Saints touchdown.

Sorensen's a ninth-year NFL veteran who signed with New Orleans as an unrestricted free agent from Kansas City, where he spent the first eight seasons of his career, posting 29 coverage stops, one special teams fumble recovery and one blocked field goal to go with 378 defensive tackles, 4.5 sacks, 12 interceptions, 33 passes defended, four forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries. Sorensen has six coverage tackles in 2022 for New Orleans.

Signed by the Saints after the 2018 NFL Draft out of Mississippi State, Gray enjoyed a banner campaign in 2021, emerging as one of the league's elite players on special teams. Voted by his teammates as the club's special teams captain for the first time, Gray led the National Football League with 19 tackles in 16 games and added three defensive stops as he was selected as a Pro Bowl starter and as the team's only first-team *Associated Press* All-Pro. Playing in 61 career games, Gray has career totals of 53 special teams stops, one blocked punt, three fumble recoveries and eight defensive tackles, 1.5 sacks and one pass defended, being ranked first on the team with nine coverage stops in 2022.

Washington, originally a seventh round draft pick of the Detroit Lions in 2016, since being promoted to the Saints active roster from the practice squad at the start of the 2018 season, the former University of Washington standout has become a core special teamer for New Orleans. Washington has recorded 15 stops, deflected a punt and recovered a blocked punt, posting a career-best seven stops in 2021. Pressed into tailback duty as well, Washington has 11 carries for 38 yards and one seven-yard reception in 2022.

WIL LUTZ

Kicker **Wil Lutz** went undrafted in 2016, joining the Ravens for training camp. Prior to the start of the regular season, Lutz joined the Black and Gold. Lutz has kicked in 91 games, converting 159-of-186 field goal attempts (85.5 percent) and 277-of-284 PATs (97.5 percent). He's recorded 351 touchbacks, the sixth-most in the NFL since 2016 despite missing the 2021 campaign with an abdominal injury. His 85.5 percent field goal percentage is best among kickers in team history. Until the 2018 regular season finale, he'd kicked a field goal in a club-record 36 consecutive games, second-longest streak in NFL history. In scoring three points on December 6, 2020 at Atlanta to reach 101, Lutz joined Pro Football Hall of Famer Morten Andersen (1985-89) as only the second Saint to score at least 100 points in five consecutive seasons, Lutz doing it in the first five years of his career. Lutz returned to the field with an immediate impact in the season-opening win at Atlanta on Sept. 11, drilling a 51-yard game winning field goal through the uprights with 19 seconds remaining to help secure a 27-26 victory for the Saints. In the past seven contests, Lutz has drilled 60– and 56-yard kicks, while making 13-of-15

field goals overall, including his last five kicks.

QUARTERBACKS

ANDY DALTON

- Dalton brings significant starting experience to the New Orleans Saints quarterback room. Originally a second round draft pick in the 2015 NFL Draft by the Cincinnati Bengals out of TCU, Dalton has played in 160 career games with 156 starts for Cincinnati (2011-19), Dallas (2020), Chicago (2021) and New Orleans this season and has completed 3,284-of-5,260 passes (62.4 pct.) for 37,098 yards, 240 touchdowns, 142 interceptions and an 87.5 passer rating. Dalton also has 457 career carries for 1,443 yards with 22 touchdowns.

• In eight starts, Dalton has completed 162-of-242 passes (66.9%) for 1,819 yards with 14 touchdowns, seven interceptions and an 96.4 passer rating. Dalton is ranked fourth in the NFL in touchdown percentage (5.9) and ninth in completion percentage, average gain (7.52) and passer rating.

SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

- Dalton received the starting nod in place of an injured Winston on October 2 against Minnesota in London and completed 20-of-28 passes (71.4%) for 236 yards with one touchdown, zero interceptions and a 108.6 passer rating.

- Dalton helped snap a three-game losing streak for New Orleans on October 9 against Seattle, as he completed 16-of-24 passes for 187 yards with one touchdown, as he helped engineer a fourth quarter 39-32 come-from-behind win.

- Dalton rebounded from three second quarter interceptions to complete 30-of-47 passes (63.8%) for 361 yards with four touchdowns vs. Arizona on Thursday night. It was the highest single-game passing yardage total by a Saints quarterback since Drew Brees passed for 373 yards against the Cardinals in the Superdome on October 27, 2019.

- Dalton was a model of efficiency in a 24-0 shutout victory over Las Vegas on October 30, when he completed 22-of-30 passes for 229 yards with two touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 117.2 passer rating.

- In Sunday's 27-20 victory over the Rams at the Caesars Superdome, Dalton completed 21-of-25 passes (career-high 84.0%) for 260 yards, three touchdowns, zero interceptions and a career-high 149.6 passer rating. It was the highest passer rating by a quarterback in 2022.

BY THE NUMBERS

JAMEIS WINSTON

- The 2013 Heisman Trophy winner at Florida State and the first pick in the 2015 NFL Draft, Winston has appeared in 86 regular season games with 80 starts, completing 1,738-of-2,835 passes (61.3%) for 21,840 yards with 139 touchdowns, 96 interceptions and an 87.7 rating, adding 1,220 rushing yards and 11 touchdowns. In 2021, before suffering a season-ending knee injury in Week Eight, Winston completed 95-of-161 passes for 1,170 yards, 14 touchdowns, three interceptions and a 102.8 passer rating, ranked first in the NFL at the time of his injury in touchdown percentage (8.7).

- In three contests in 2022, Winston has completed 73-of-115 passes for 858 yards with four touchdowns, five interceptions and a 79.5 passer rating.

POWERFUL STARTS

• Winston improved his record in season-opening starts to 4-2 and became only the third Saints quarterback to win his first two season-opening starts as a member of the Black and Gold. Winston completed 21-of-30 passes for 269 yards and two touchdowns for 213 yards, two touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 111.0 passer rating in the 27-26 win over Atlanta on Sept. 11.

• In the 2021 season opener vs. Green Bay played in Jacksonville, Fla., Winston had one of the most impressive first starts in a Black and Gold uniform amongst its signal-callers. He passed for 148 yards on 14-of-20 passing (70.0%) with a 130.8 rating. Winston threw five touchdown passes. His five touchdown passes tied a career-high. He also finished with 37 rushing yards on six attempts. In his first start with the Saints, Winston became the third player since 1950 to throw for five touchdowns in his first start with a team. Winston's 148 passing yards is the fewest yards with five passing touchdowns since 1948. With zero interceptions, Winston became the first quarterback in NFL history to throw five touchdown passes with no interceptions in his first career start with a new team in an opener. Overall, Winston became the seventh quarterback with five touchdowns and no interceptions in an opener, and first since Baltimore's Lamar Jackson did so at Miami on Sept. 8, 2019. Winston became the 33rd player to start a game at quarterback for New Orleans, and the 11th to win in his first start. It was Winston's first career win over Green Bay.

COMEBACK KID

• In the September 11 come-from-behind victory over Atlanta, Winston engineered the Saints from a 16-point fourth quarter deficit for the first time in franchise history. In leading two touchdown drives and the game-winning field goal drive, he completed 13-of-16 passes (81.3 percent) for 213 yards with two touchdowns and a perfect 158.3 passer rating in the final period of the contest. It was the 13th fourth quarter/overtime comeback of Winston's career. New Orleans came from 16 points behind in the fourth quarter for the victory for the first time in franchise history, the 209th time, they were 16 points or more behind in a fourth quarter.

SECOND THROUGH FIVE

He ranked first on the club and sixth in the NFL in yards from scrimmage (1,554), second on the team in rushing and receiving, carrying 120 times for 728 yards (6.1 avg.) with eight TDs and a two-point conversion, catching 81 passes for 826 yards (10.2 avg.) with five TDs and a kickoff return for a TD for a club rookie record 14 total scores, tied for second in the NFL. Kamara finished first in the NFL in yards per carry.

• Kamara was the first Saints offensive rookie selected to the Pro Bowl since Rueben Mayes (1986), as an AP second team All-Pro (flex), the clubs' first rookie All-Pro since

1993. He was named *The Sporting News* NFL Rookie of the Year and AP NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year.

WIDE RECEIVERS**JARVIS LANDRY**

• Signed by New Orleans as a free agent after the 2022 NFL Draft, this former Litcher High and LSU standout returns home as one of the league's most accomplished receivers has quickly established chemistry with the Saints offense to become one of its top targets. Posting career totals in 129 career games with 115 starts with Miami (2014-17), Cleveland (2018-21) and the Saints (2022), the five-time Pro Bowler has produced 709 catches for 7,836 yards with 38 touchdowns. He ranks fifth in the NFL in receptions since coming into the league as a second round pick of the Dolphins in 2014. Landry is just one of five players to have 700-plus catches since 2014. Since being drafted in 2014, Landry is ranked fifth in the league in receptions (706), eighth in first down receptions (404) and ninth in receiving yards (7,836).

HOMECOMING

Landry made an immediate impact in the uniform of his home state team on September 11 at Atlanta, grabbing a team-leading seven passes for a team-high 114 yards (club-best 16.3 yards per reception), with four of his catches going for first downs. Landry was particularly clutch on New Orleans' drive for the game-winning field goal late in the fourth quarter, when he made a difficult catch for a 40-yard gain, the longest reception of the game for the Saints. Playing in all four games, Landry has fought through an ankle injury that has sidelined him for the five games and returned to the lineup on November 13 at Pittsburgh with three grabs for 37 yards then posted three grabs for 33 yards with his first touchdown as a Saint in Sunday's win over the Los Angeles Rams. He will look to build on his 21 receptions for 238 yards with the scoring grab over the final six games of the season in helping New Orleans make a push up the NFC South division race.

TWO AT A TIME

Since Week 2 of his rookie season in 2014 until Week 2 of the 2021 campaign, Landry caught at least two passes in 111 consecutive games. His streak was the best in the NFL since 2014 and was the fourth-longest all-time.

CHRIS OLAVE

- A talented wide receiver who became one of the most prolific receivers in Buckeyes history, Olave played in 47 games and caught 176 passes for 2,711 yards (15.4 avg.) with 35 touchdowns. Olave's 35 career touchdown receptions set an Ohio State program record and ranks fourth in Big Ten history. His 11 career 100-yard games also ranks second in school history. Olave entered the starting lineup in 2019 with immediate results. He helped lead the Buckeyes to three consecutive Big Ten championships (2018-2020) and back-to-back College Football Playoff appearances (2019, 2020). In the 2020 CFP Semifinal vs. Clemson, Olave had a career night, hauling in six passes for 132 yards and two touchdowns in a 49-28 win, securing a bid to play in the championship game. Olave will look to integrate into the Saints offense in training camp after a standout senior campaign, where he caught 65 passes for 936 yards (14.4 avg.) and 13 touchdowns, tied for sixth nationally, as he was selected as an AFCA first-team All-American and a consensus second-team All-American.

- Following a September, where he captured NFL Offensive Rookie of the Month honors with 17 grabs for a league rookie-best 268 yards, followed by scoring receiving touchdowns in back to back contests, Olave leads the team in receiving, yards per catch and receiving yardage with 51 grabs for 760 yards (14.9 avg.) with three touchdowns

along with a successful two-point conversion. He leads all NFL rookies in receptions, receiving yards and leads the entire NFL in third down receptions (20). Olave's entering position to threaten several of the club's rookie receiving records.

TIGHT ENDS

ADAM TRAUTMAN

- The Saints were pleased to find the 6-5, 253-pound Trautman available near the end of the third round of the 2020 NFL Draft and made an aggressive trade up to the 105th pick to add him out of Dayton. A converted high school quarterback, the Michigan native moved to tight end as a freshman developed into one of the top offensive player in NCAA FCS football, where he played in 44 games, recording 178 receptions for 2,295 yards (12.9 avg.) and 31 touchdowns. Though 16 contests in 2020, Trautman posted 15 receptions for 171 yards with one touchdown while also impressively developing his blocking ability.

- In 2021, Trautman continued progress in both blocking and pass-catching, leading the tight end unit with 27 grabs for 263 yards and two touchdowns. In 2022, despite being sidelined by an ankle injury for two contests, he has recorded 13 grabs for 128 yards and one touchdown, while adding a fumble recovery on special teams.

TAYSOM HILL

• Hill's brought unheralded versatility to the Saints offense and special teams. A constant participant on special teams from midseason in 2017 to midseason in 2020, as well as the backup signal-caller and as a runner and receiver, in 2018, Hill averaged 24.9 yards per return on 14 kickoff returns, had six coverage stops, second on the team, completed a ten-yard pass on a fake punt and blocked a punt. Overall, Hill carried 37 times for 196 yards (5.3 avg.), third on the team, with two touchdowns and completed three of seven passes for 64 yards. The blocked punt that sparked a division-clinching win at Tampa Bay, earning him Week 14 NFC Special Teams Player of the Week honors. In the postseason, he caught a touchdown, made a special teams tackle and executed a successful fake punt, making significant contributions in all facets as the team advanced to the NFC Championship game for the third time in franchise history.

• In 2019, Hill carried 27 times for 156 yards (5.8 avg.) with a touchdown, catching 19 passes for 234 yards with six TDs, deflecting a punt and posting two coverage stops. He ranked third on the club in touchdowns and third in receiving TDs. After a multi-threat performance Thanksgiving night at Atlanta, when he deflected a punt and caught and rushed for a touchdown. Hill became the first quarterback to rush for and catch a touchdown in the same contest since Jim McMahon (1983). In a valiant postseason effort vs. Minnesota, Hill led the team in rushing with four carries for 50 yards, caught two passes for 25 yards with a TD and completed a 50-yard pass.

• In 2020, Hill contributed on multiple facets, completing 88-of-121 passes (72.7%) for 928 yards with a 98.8 rating, rushing 87 times for 457 (5.3 avg.) yards with eight touchdowns, catching eight passes for 98 yards with a TD and playing on special teams units until Brees' rib injury. Following Brees' injury, November 15, Hill went 3-1 in four starts.

• In 12 games with nine starts in 2021, providing value at quarterback on offense and special teams, he completed 78-of-134 passes for 978 yards with four touchdowns, carried 70 times for 374 yards (5.3 avg.) with a club-best five touchdowns, caught four passes for 52 yards and added a special teams stop.

• In 2022, Hill will assist the Black and Gold offense in multiple facets. Making his debut in that role, he contributed on both offense and special teams in the season opener at Atlanta, Hill carried four times for a club-best 81 yards (20.3

avg.), including a career-long 57-yard carry, as well as an 11-yard rushing touchdown on the same first quarter drive of his long run. Hill also caught a pass for a two-yard gain and contributed on multiple special teams units both on the coverage and return teams. Overall, he ranks second on the team in rushing with 52 carries for 396 yards (club-best 7.6 avg.) with a club-best five rushing touchdowns, four catches for 24 yards with one score, for six total touchdowns (tied for fourth in the NFL), while completing eight-of-13 passes for 115 yards with one touchdown and a 115.9 passer rating.

RECORD BREAKER

In the October 9 39-22 win over Seattle, Hill put together one of the most impressive combined efforts by a Saint on both offense and special teams. Hill carried nine times for a career-high 112 yards (club-record 12.4 avg.) with a career-high three touchdowns, including a career-long 60-yard rushing touchdown in the fourth quarter. In addition, he tossed a 22-yard touchdown pass to Trautman and returned three kickoffs to tie a career-high for a career-best 69 yards. He's also the first player since the NFL merger to register a kick return, two rushing touchdowns and a passing touchdown in the same game. Hill became the second player in franchise history with at least three rushing touchdowns and a passing touchdown in the same game, joining Archie Manning (at Chicago, 10/2/77). Hill's the third player ever to record at least 100 rushing yards, three rushing touchdowns and a touchdown pass in a single game, joining Ronnie Brown (September 21, 2008) and Pro Football Hall of Famer LaDainian Tomlinson (September 25, 2005). Hill now has 21 career rushing touchdowns, seven career touchdown receptions and nine career touchdown passes. He joins Tomlinson as the only players since 2000 with at least 20 rushing touchdowns, five receiving touchdowns and five touchdown passes in their career.

DEFENSIVE LINE**CAMERON JORDAN**

• New Orleans' first choice in the 2011 NFL Draft (24th overall) out of California, Jordan enjoyed another standout season in 2021, recording 59 tackles, 12.5 sacks for a loss of 75.5 yards, tied for seventh in the NFL, including 8.5 takedowns in the last four contests to lead the league over that period, six passes defended and two forced fumbles. Jordan was selected to his seventh Pro Bowl, the most by a defensive Saint and second overall in team records. With 112.5 career sacks, Jordan is second on the Saints career sack list and 24th on the NFL's takedown list. He has headlined the only defense in the NFL to rank both in the top five in run defense and sacks over that period.

JORDAN SACK NOTES

Jordan is ranked second on the club's all-time sack list, ranked 24th in National Football League record books, needing 2.5 to tie the franchise record currently held by Rickey Jackson. With a split on Sunday at San Francisco, he would move into a tie for 23rd all-time in NFL record books with Sean Jones and with one would take sole possession of 23rd.

BACK TO BACK TO BACK

With 3.5 sacks on January 2, 2022 vs. Carolina preceded by two takedowns apiece at Tampa Bay on December 19, 2021 and vs. Miami on December 27, Jordan became the first player to have multiple takedowns in three consecutive games in the NFL since he had a similar stretch from November 22-December 9, 2018.

With at least one sack in the final four contests of 2021, Jordan did so twice in a season for the first time. • This dependable and sure-tackling defender joined the New Orleans Saints in 2018 after spending his first six National Football League seasons with the New York Jets and Cleveland Browns. For his career, the Brandon, Miss. native has appeared in 171 career regular season games with 157 starts for the Jets (2012-15, 2017), Cleveland (2016) and the Saints (2018-), recording 1,171 stops (771 solo), 36 sacks, two interceptions, 47 passes defended, three forced fumbles, seven fumble recoveries and 24 special teams tackles.

• In 2018, Davis opened all 16 contests and led the team with 110 stops (74 solo), five sacks to lead the linebackers, four passes defended, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. Davis' abilities to diagnose and tackle played a key role in New Orleans ranking second in the NFL in opponent rushing yards per game and opponent rushing yards per play. • New Orleans selected this three-year starter from Ohio State in the second round of the 2021 NFL Draft. The Indianapolis native finished his college career playing in 47 career games with 35 starts, recording 185 tackles (111 solo), 16 stops for loss, four sacks, 11 passes defended, four forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. • Selected by the Saints in the first round (11th overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft, Lattimore started all 13 games he appeared in. He totaled 53 tackles (44 solo), a forced fumble, one fumble recovery, five interceptions for 85 yards and 18 passes defended, as he became the youngest Saint (21 years old) ever selected to the Pro Bowl and was selected as the AP NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year.

• In 2018, Lattimore opened all 16 contests and posted a career-high 59 tackles (49 solo), two interceptions, 12 passes defended, a club-best four forced fumbles, tied for fourth in the NFL and three fumble recoveries, returned for 91 yards, leading the team in takeaways and tied for the NFL lead in defensive fumble recoveries, the highest total among defensive backs.

- The Saints beat the Los Angeles Rams 27-20 Sunday, improving to 4-7 on the year. New Orleans will travel to San Francisco next week to take on the 49ers. The game will kick off at 3:25 pm CT and will be broadcast on FOX regionally (FOX 8 WVUE locally).
- With the win, the Saints notch their 400th regular season victory as a franchise.
- The win also marks the second straight season New Orleans has beaten the defending Super Bowl Champions, beating the Tampa Bay Buccaneers twice in 2021.
- With a win against Los Angeles today and against Seattle on October 9, along with a loss at Arizona on October 20, the Saints have a 2-1 record against their NFC West opponents in 2022, looking to close the slate with a win at the 49ers next Sunday. In 2019, the Saints posted a 2-2 mark against the NFC West, the division they resided in from 1970-2001.
- New Orleans committed just two penalties for 15 yards compared to six penalties for 55 yards for the Rams.
- The Saints tallied 19 first downs compared to 17 first downs for the Rams.
- QB **Andy Dalton** completed 21-of-25 passes (career-high 84.0%) for 260 yards and three touchdowns, completing 11 passes in a row in the second half. It was the third time in Dalton's career (min. ten attempts) that he completed 80% of his passes.
- Dalton posted a career-high passer rating of 149.6, surpassing his previous career high of 146.8 he set with the Bengals on Dec. 6, 2015, against the Cleveland Browns. It was the third time that Dalton has posted a passer rating of at least 145.0
- With the win today, Dalton has a 3-2 record as a starter against the Rams, breaking a two-game losing streak against Los Angeles.
- RB **Alvin Kamara** became the second Saint ever to tally 9,000 career scrimmage yards, joining Marques Colston, now at 9,010, after finishing the game with 12 carries for 42 yards and four receptions for 47 yards.
- WR **Jarvis Landry** caught his first touchdown as a Saint in the third quarter. Landry finished with three catches for 33 yards and the touchdown.
- WR **Chris Olave** caught a career-long 53-yard touchdown reception in the third quarter. Olave led the Saints with five catches for 102 yards and a touchdown. It's the Ohio State product's third career 100-yard game. With one more 100-yard receiving game, he would tie Colston (2006) for the most in a rookie season by a Saint.
- TE **Juwan Johnson** caught his fifth touchdown of the season and his fifth in his last five games. The five touchdowns set a new career-high for Johnson.
- Johnson finished the game with three catches for 47 yards and a touchdown.
- TE **Taysom Hill** led the Saints with 52 rushing yards on nine carries.
- Hill also had one reception for eight yards and completed one pass for 14 yards.
- T **Landon Young** made his first career start at left tackle, OL **Calvin Throckmorton** started at left guard and OL **Josh Andrews** made his second career start at center.
- Defensively, the Saints have 31 sacks since Week 3, leading the NFL over the period. They notched four today.
- LB **Kaden Elliss** posted a career-high 10 tackles, tying for the team lead in takedowns (1.5). Elliss also added one special teams stop.
- Elliss also tied DE **Carl Granderson**, who received his first start of the season, for the lead in sacks with 1.5 apiece. It was Granderson's second multi-sack performance
- Granderson also posted a career-high seven tackles.

- Seven Saints defenders tallied over five tackles in the contest.
- DB **Paulson Adebo** had five solo tackles.
- LB **Demario Davis** played in and started his 75th game as a Saint Sunday, totaling eight tackles (three solo), and half a sack, to give him a career-high and club-best 6.5 quarterback takedowns.
- DE **Jabari Zuniga** had two solo tackles in his first game as a Saint after being elevated from the practice squad Saturday.
- K **Wil Lutz** went two-for-two on field goals with a long of 46 yards, scoring a total of nine points to go with three PATs. Five of Lutz's six kickoffs also sailed through the end zone for touchbacks.
- WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed** returned a career-high four punts for a career-high 40 yards, also catching a pass for eight yards.
- P **Blake Gillikin** punted five times for 239 yards with a 47.8 gross punting average and 45.0 net, with three inside-the-20-yard line, including one downed at the Rams two-yard line by LB **Andrew Dowell**.

(Opening Statement): "Hell of a win for us against a team that's the defending Super Bowl champion. Proud of the way our guys played. I really thought, offensively, I thought we played really well in the game, specifically there in the second half for us to be able to move the ball like we did. Coming out to start the second half and getting a touchdown was a huge momentum boost for us. Happy to get the win and ready to get back to work."

(On halftime adjustments): "I think we felt like there were some opportunities for us, and I think our guys took advantage of those opportunities. We felt like there was some stuff we could do in the run game we liked against them. We got to a few of those plays in the second half. I don't know that the touchdown pass to (Chris) Olave was, under the circumstances, what we expected, but we got a good look. Olave ran a great route, and Andy (Dalton) put the ball on him. It was great protection. Our offensive line for as banged up as they are, I thought they came out against a really good front and played outstandingly in the game. There's a lot of young guys that stepped up and took on an added role and played well."

(On planning for Matthew Stafford): "We had a pretty good feel for (Matthew) Stafford playing in the game. We had a little bit of a plan for (Bryce) Perkins being in the game, but we didn't expect to see him for a whole half. We had to make a few adjustments there as we went along. We kind of anticipated seeing Stafford, and we had to adjust a little bit when we saw a lot more of Perkins."

(On the offensive line's performance against Aaron Donald): "Put as many hats on (Aaron Donald) as we can. He's a hell of a player. It's hard to block him with one. It's hard to block him with two. We just tried to put as many hats on him as we could and tried to limit his ability to just take over the game. I thought overall, our guys did a pretty good job. I know he made some plays, but I thought overall the offensive line deserves a lot of credit. I think the offensive coaches, specifically the line coaches, getting those guys ready to play, I thought that was outstanding."

(On field position positively impacting the offensive performance): "Anytime you get good field position, it's beneficial for the offense. We've talked about that a lot in terms of creating field position for the offense. Look, we had a punt where we pinned them down on the two-yard line. We were able to get off the field defensively and create some field position there. That's really what a complementary game is all about. That's really what a team win is all about, creating field position and taking advantage of it, and we got it."

(On the decision to play both Andy Dalton and Taysom Hill evenly at times): "I just think each week we go in and try to figure out what is the best way we can move the ball and be effective and score points. I felt like we had a good plan for both Andy and Taysom at the quarterback position. I thought Pete (Carmichael) called a good game. I thought those guys went out there and executed the plan. It's always good when it works, right? I thought the offense did a really good job."

(On the quarterback plan going forward): "We are just trying to win games. I do not really look at it that way. We put a plan together offensively that we go out and execute. I think our players went out and executed at a high level, and we won a football game. We'll take that and feel good about it and be ready to move on to the next one."

(On playing a clean game with limited penalties): "We didn't do things that were going to beat ourselves today. I thought that was good to see. I thought we had a great week of practice. I thought our guys were locked in, focused in on playing. They knew what we had to do. We had some guys that haven't played a lot that stepped up and did some good things."

(On the offensive recipe going forward): "I think we have to look at that on a week-by-week basis. I am not ready to sit here and say we are just going to carbon copy the game plan for next week. Next week, we have a different opponent who will be challenging, but yeah, I thought it was a good plan. I thought our guys executed."

(On Dalton's response to the game plan): "(Andy Dalton)'s a veteran player. He's been in this league for a long time. He understands how things operate. We all know as a football team, all of us understand, that when you're not having the success that you want to have that everything is going to get evaluated. I think he's handled it outstandingly. I think our whole group has handled the pressures of the season and not probably living up to the expectations we had for ourselves. I think they all handled that well, and it all showed out there today."

(On Dalton's performance against the Rams): "It was great. It was awesome. I give a ton of credit to the offensive coaches and the offensive players. Again, put a good plan together, go out and execute the plan. That's what they did today."

(On the defensive line): "It looked like they played pretty well. I don't know if we got as much pressure as we would have liked as early on, especially in that two-minute drive. I thought we were more effective at getting at the quarterback in the second half, but I think overall, it looked to me, that they did pretty well. Obviously, we lost Payton (Turner) fairly early in the game."

(On the complementary football played across all three phases): "I thought really with the exception of probably the one (kickoff) return, I thought all three phases played well today. There wasn't a ton of negatives to talk about. There were just guys who went out and played good football. That's what you have to do in the league. You just have to go out and do your job and just play football. I thought we did that today."

(On the mentality of the team this week): "Look, we are well aware of where we are at in the season. I thought our guys came out, and they were swinging today. It was good to see."

Bryce (Perkins) came in there and did some good things, and we were able to get the run game going. I thought that the two minute drill at the end of the (first) half (that ended with a touchdown) was a positive. There were some good times where we got some stops defensively, but just not enough. That first drive of the second half (Saints touchdown) ends up hurting you. Overcoming some of those things, really, the truth is it becomes a real challenge and it changes the way that you are really able to operate. There were some chances for us to be able to do some things or get us back in that game. Even on the one touchdown they had to (Chris) Olave, Aaron (Donald) does a great job of winning quickly, and (Andy) Dalton gets it out, and we are just not right in position on the back end. You do not take away credit from those guys (the Saints). That’s where we are at right now.”

(on if Stafford has been diagnosed with a concussion) “No, not yet, not to my knowledge. I have got to talk to the doctors. Obviously, we have got to make a smart decision for Matthew and see where we are at with that. Until I get with those guys afterwards (I won’t know). I know how he was feeling. He communicated that. We made the decision that it was going to be in his best interests to not have him continue to play. He wants to be out there to continue to battle with his guys. I’ll talk to Reggie (Scott) and his group and our doctors, and make a decision that’s best for Matthew.”

(on what he said to Stafford on the sideline) “I was just asking him what did he feel. We were just having that dialogue, and he communicated that to me. We go through the checks and balances, and that’s when we made the determination that it would be best (for him not to play).”

(on what it will mean if the team has to play without Stafford) “Probably too soon for me to be able to answer that one. There’s a lot of things that we are working through that are, I’d say, unprecedented. What I do appreciate is the way the guys continue to battle (and) continue to try and compete. We are going to coach these guys up that we have got. As far as it relates to Matthew, we are going to be smart for him. He is such a warrior; he is such a stud competitor. I know how bad he wants to be out there. I thought that he played really well with the opportunities that he did have.”

(on defensive breakdowns in the second half) “There were some opportunities. The one that I mentioned to (Chris) Olave where we end up winning (at the line), we end up getting beat on the back end. Until I go back and look at the film, it’s hard for me to really say. They (the Saints) were able to get some drives and sustain some different things, so it’s not one thing in general. There was a handful of different things, and we’ve got to be able to execute there.”

(on what he told the team after the game) “What you do is you are realistic about we’re going to continue to battle (and) make the most of the opportunities when they are continued to be presented. Let’s look at the film, and let’s be honest with ourselves. Let’s see if we can get guys to play as well as they possibly can. The amount of moving parts that you have, sometimes, does challenge you. It is not an excuse. You are just saying that this is the reality. That’s where we are at, and that’s what you tell those guys.”

(on where the lack of cohesiveness is coming from) “I wish I could tell you. That has been a challenging thing. We’ve got to be able to figure it out and understand how to be able to play off of one another in relation to some of that energy that we can create on our own. While you are out there at separate times, we’ve got to be able to understand and have really great urgency when those opportunities present themselves. We didn’t do a good job of that today.”

(on if it’s a steep mountain to climb when the Saints score, and then Matthew Stafford is taken out of the game) “It’s more challenging, for sure, especially just the way that Matthew had played and the command that he had, even some of the times where he’s having to let some stuff go in anticipation.

We had a couple of drops early on third down or even the ones on second down, where we could have had some good, positive plays. It is (hard), but you don't really think of it like that, other than just being in the moment and navigating the situation and the circumstances that you are dealt."

(on the lateral on the punt that was called back on penalty) "It was a good positive play, then they called a hold. I will have to go back and look at it. That is a fair statement (that it was indicative of the day overall)."

(on how to keep the team from giving up on the season) "I think you challenge the guys to have enough pride to know that we are all professionals here. This is our job. We've got to be able to focus on getting better and going back to work. That's what pros do. You've got to have enough pride and understand that these are some challenging times, but you can't jump off of the roller coaster. You've got to be able to stay on track. Right now it feels bad. It's not fun. There is nothing that is fun about it, but what you can't do is you can't stop. You've got to be able to keep pushing, because these lessons will be beneficial, even though it may not seem like it. That's the only way that you can really look at it. That is what we are going to continue to do, in spite of all of these circumstances. You want to make sure that you are pouring into these guys, whoever it is that we have out there and try to give ourselves the best chance to go and compete. That is all that I know how to do. It has been a lot of different stuff (this year). There is no question about it."

QB ANDY DALTON

(On the touchdown pass to Chris Olave) “Yeah, we had a little pressure too. When you turn it loose and get hit to the ground, you never know what’s going to happen. To have that outcome and I put the ball in a great spot, it was exactly how we had it planned by taking that shot down the field. We got the look that we wanted and he made a great play.”

(On if he sat on that play waiting for that look) “Every week you draw up a game plan. You install your plays and would love to have a certain look versus certain plays. You don’t always get the look that you want. When Pete (Carmichael) called it, it was the perfect time. It happened exactly how we hoped it would.”

(On how aware he was of Aaron Donald closing in on that play) “I was pretty aware. At the end of the day you have to play on time. When you can play on time, then good things happen. Half a second longer and that is a sack or an incomplete pass. For us, guys were doing it exactly how we wanted it done. If you can play on time at the quarterback position and get the ball out, then good things can happen.”

(On how big the two drives coming out after halftime were) “Huge. We knew we were getting the ball at the start of the second half. They scored right before halftime. For us, we wanted to get into a rhythm early and I thought that we did a great job of being aggressive. The first play of the second half we had a big play to Chris (Olave) and then we had the momentum from then on. To go down and score was huge and it was exactly what we wanted to do.”

(On having Jarvis Landry back) “It’s really big. Everyone know what Jarvis can do and what he has done throughout his career. We can continue to find ways to get him the ball. He made some big plays for us. The touchdown was awesome. It’s exactly what we want. A couple of plays before he caught a nice seam ball that allowed us to get down there.”

(On continuing momentum offensively for next week) “For us, we have to carry the momentum over to this week. It’s the most important thing that we can do. We can enjoy this win today. Moving forward, we need to continue to do the things we did well and make corrections. That is the nature of this game week in and week out. We have to correct the mistakes, but it is easier to correct the mistakes off a win. Everybody understands that. The feeling in the building after a win’s very positive and the best.”

(On if he felt like it was a give it everything we got mentality today) “That is kind of where we are at. I think we just need to cut it loose. Why not? For us, I felt like there were some things we did today like maybe earlier in the season we wouldn’t have done. I think that’s a big reason why we are standing here with a win today. I think being aggressive is something that we came into the game knowing what we can do. You can look at the first third down of the game and throwing the ball down the field on third and one. I think that is just the mentality that we have to have.”

(On if he has to overcome getting less reps in practice) “No, I’m never upset with the number of reps that Taysom takes because I know how successful we are because of it and how many positive plays come from it. Taysom is a unique asset for it. A lot of teams have really good players. We just happen to have one that can be all over the field and can play quarterback too. I think that is to our advantage and there is no discouragement when it happens.”

(On responding with his performance when not knowing if he would start this week possibly earlier in the week) “No, I think at the end of the day I am happy with the way that we were able to play today. The adversity that we have faced the last couple of weeks especially offensively and everybody talking about how we haven’t scored enough points. For us to put all of that aside and focus on this

game, we had a great plan coming into this week and were able to execute it. Regardless of all the other stuff that goes on, that is what makes you most proud. That is for me personally and this group.”

(On the play of Juwan Johnson) “Juwan has done so many good things. His ability to stretch the field and get open and the matchup that we get with him has been very good for us. It doesn’t surprise me that he has scored as many touchdowns as he has. He’s a really good player for us.”

(On how close they were on hitting that trick play) “I do not know. I will have to look at it on film. It probably wasn’t the most ideal look for it. I have to find a way to throw it a way and avoid the sack.”

(On if he wants to reward Dennis Allen for sticking with him as the starter) “I think at the end of the day I want to play the way that I know I am capable of playing. I know if I do that then everybody will be happy with it. At the end of the day, I have to do the job that I know that I am capable of doing and play the way I am capable of playing and the rest of all that stuff will take care of itself.”

WR CHRIS OLAVE

(On his touchdown reception in the second half) "Coach (Pete Carmichael) called a really good play on third down. We practiced that on that look this week. We got the look that we wanted. Andy (Dalton) threw a great ball. The line protected well and that was the outcome."

(On how much they needed the win) "It was much needed. We had consecutive bad games. To get a win against the reigning champs was huge. I feel like it is a great step that we can take forward."

(On if the quarterback movement has any impact on the receiver position) "Not really. I just try to help them as much as possible. They (Dalton and Taysom Hill) are both great quarterbacks along with Jameis (Winston). They are doing a great job. I'm just there to be supportive and to make sure that I am doing my job, so that they can count on me."

(On if they made any changes at halftime) "Not really. We just came out aggressive. We knew that we had to move the ball down the field and score points to win the game. That's what we did coming out of halftime. We just started clicking in the second half. We took over the momentum. The defense played a great game also. We just had some good plays early and built off that."

(On taking pride in stretching the field) "I feel like that's my job and that's why they drafted me to be here. I feel like I can stretch the field and get open at all times. I feel like I'm trying to make it easier on the quarterback and my teammates make me a lot better. We definitely needed this win and we found some energy in the second half. We have some momentum going forward to next week."

(On having Jarvis Landry back on the field) "It's great having him on and off the field. He's a great leader as he has been throughout his career. He has that dog mentality. He rubs off on other people. Having him off the field when things aren't going well, then he is picking everybody up. Jarvis has definitely helped me out throughout my first year."

(On if he feels any pressure of getting open quicker with Aaron Donald on the field) "Yes, it is Aaron Donald. It is really a race against the defensive line. He's a great player probably one of the best players in the league. We definitely want to speed up everything and get open. We just wanted to stick to our game. We knew if we played our game then it would come out well."

LB DEMARIO DAVIS

(On how much fun he had in today's game) "It's great when we are able to come out and play with the energy and speed we are capable of. We pin our ears back and play with speed. It was just one of those days. It was a ton of fun."

(On having a clean game without penalties) "It's a week by week basis. I feel like you can't look forward or look back at this point in the season. There were some things that we did well today and certainly some things we can improve upon. Regardless, we have to take a look at the tape and keep leveling up. It was great to go out there and get a win, but we need to find ways to get better."

(On staving off despair at this point in the season where they were 3-7 going into the game and having lost two straight) "The main thing is to focus on where you are. No matter what it was coming in, today was an opportunity to snap back in and today we were able to do that and it was a lot of fun doing it."

(On adjusting to the backup quarterback coming in when Matthew Stafford had to leave) "That's the importance of studying your film. That wasn't the first time that we saw that quarterback. He has played a ton on film. We knew that he could run the ball well. He could run the wildcat offense. I think they use him (Bryce Perkins) in a lot of ways that we use Taysom (Hill). We had seen him on field, but not in two minute situations. He did some good things and made it challenging on us."

(On Kaden Elliss) "55's probably for the last few years been the best kept secret in the NFL. We knew what type of player that he was and he is getting an opportunity to show the world. I know that no one is shocked when they watch him in our building. Just give him some time and he is going to be on everybody's radar."

(On missing defensive linemen) “We take it one day at a time and it’s always a next man up mentality. It is actually quite phenomenal. We don’t have Marshon Lattimore or (Bradley) Roby. We do not have Cam Jordan. We lose Payton Turner. We do not have Pete Werner. If you think about all of the guys we have that play at a high level that are not in our lineup (today), for us to go out there and execute is phenomenal. It feels really good, but that is just the nature of the league. One of our slogans is most of the people don’t care about your problems and the other half are glad that you got them. Regardless, you have to find a way and we were able to do that today.”

(On his leadership approach and message to the team) “My message to the team was you can learn a lot from nature. If you think about palm trees, they bend but they do not break. Hurricanes come and blow palm trees and they lean all of the way to the ground. They never break. The reason why they do not is because every time they have a storm they dig deeper. Their roots grow deeper into the ground. That’s what we do. That’s the great thing about this team and this city. It is so resilient. We have been faced with a lot of adversity. Sometimes it feels like storm on top of storm, but the great thing is that it is making our roots grow deeper. When that storm passes, we always snap back. That is’ the exciting thing. It was great putting that on display today. It certainly felt like a snap back moment. It was a lot of fun.”

TE TAYSOM HILL

(On if the team was desperate today) “We are well aware of where we are in our season and our record and everything else. I think we approach every week with the same mentality. I think this week there may have been a more added emphasis to win the football game like what do we have to lose. Let’s call everything that we have on this call sheet. Let’s push the ball down the field. I think that maybe that was emphasized a little bit more then it was in the past.”

(On if he’s happy being back in this role) “For me personally, I don’t think anything has every changed from 2018 to where we are at now. There was a lot of conversation earlier about me going to the tight end room, what that is going to look like and everything else. I talked and met with Pete (Carmichael) and at the end of the day they just want to use me more. I feel like that is what that was. As the season has played out through week 11, I ‘m not surprised how things have gone and this how I have always envisioned it. Every week is a little bit different. We got ahead throughout the game and it kind of allowed us to run everything that we had on the call sheet. It was just more opportunities for me. There is still opportunities in previous weeks. We just didn’t get to them.”

(On if they got to more of the package today) “I think we just got to it more today. The last few weeks, we just didn’t have enough snaps. I think every game is a little bit different. The focus is what do we have to do to win this week. It was for me to get more opportunities.”

(On his role) “Honestly, I don’t think my role has changed from what we have done in years past with Sean (Payton) to what I have done with Pete.”

(On the energy and approach this week) “The attitude was like let’s go cut it loose. Early on there was a lot of conversations on how we were going to win football games and a little hesitancy. (On the offensive line play today with the injuries that resulted in three new starters) “I think they did a great job. I haven’t seen statistically what the numbers were, but I felt like we ran the ball really well, but those guys came in and battled. I was really impressed with what they did. The coaches put us in the best place to be successful. They spend a lot of time and they did that.”

(On if it felt like a clean game) “For sure, the ball security stuff is talked about a lot. Field position and time of possession...we were able to check the boxes this week.”

(On what a win like this does moving forward) “That’s a Ram team that’s a little banged up, but they won the Super Bowl last year. We are well aware of that. (Thoughts on entering the game under the circumstances) “Watching Matthew [Stafford] go to the tent, at first, I thought he was going in there for a little and then coming back out. He’s tough as nails. But then he was there a little longer and longer and I began to warm up and get the body loose. My guys did a great job communicating to me that they have my back. I let them know that it was going to be a little different, but we will get situated so I appreciate those guys embracing me and helping me out. They did a great job picking me up.

(On how it was between him and coach (Sean) McVay) “We defiantly kept things more simplified and as the game kept going, he told me ‘Don’t be afraid to use your feet when a play breaks down.’ He mentioned how one of my traits is the ability to use my legs so that gave freedom to make plays and have fun.”

(On if his preseason experienced helped him any today) “Preseason was a long time ago. I think even last week, getting in there for a few snaps kind of helped me go in there today and operate more smoothly than if I didn’t get those reps in. It’s different being away than being home, but it was not as clean as it could have been but I appreciate everyone for helping me out.”

(On the sequence of the delay of game penalty and 3rd and 13 play) “That delay of game was totally on me. I made the wrong call to the offense. The next play, we had a shot, but I overshot it. I just did not execute that part of the play. I came to the sideline and the coaches did a good job of encouraging me to move on to the next play. That was definitely a play that could have been cleaner but getting out there and in the swing of things will take a little time.”

(On TuTu Atwell’s first quarter touchdown) “I was happy for him. I know how bad TuTu wants it and his journey from last year to this year. We know one of those plays was going to pop. He’s the fastest guy out there. We knew if he got a shot, he [Stafford] was going to let it go. Matthew did a great job getting it to him and everyone was happy for him. You could see it on the sideline everybody jumping up and down and meeting him before he came off the field. That’s what football is about. Those guys having fun and other people on your team that work with you throughout the summer, throughout OTA’s, through training camp, when you go out and make a play, everyone is excited for you. That’s why football is the best team sport out there.”

(On his take about the Saints defense) “Usually when a backup quarterback comes in you get a lot more zeros. There weren’t as many zeros if any. Really five-man rushes. It was pretty similar as when Matthew [Stafford] was out there. Not much changed coverage wise which sometimes, when you get the backup, you try to show different pressures and looks. I felt like I had a good understanding, seeing everything and possibilities of pressures. I definitely can grow as far as the overall operation of getting in and out of the huddle but getting out there I felt pretty comfortable about what I was seeing.”
