THE MATCHUP

The New Orleans Saints (2-2) will make their 2024 prime time debut on Monday Night Football playing at the Super Bowl LVIII Champion Kansas City Chiefs (4-0) on Monday Night Football at GEHA Field at Arrowhead Stadium. The contest with a 7:15 p.m. CT kickoff will be nationally televised on ESPN. New Orleans will be looking to break a two-game losing streak where both losses were by a combined total of only five points.

In Sunday's 26-24 loss to the Atlanta Falcons at Mercedes-Benz Stadium, New Orleans took a lead against Atlanta into the game's final possession before dropping a 26-24 heartbreaker. Kicker **Young-hoe Koo**'s career-long 58-yard field goal with two seconds remaining, with Atlanta gaining 30 yards of field position on a costly pass interference penalty to seal the win for Atlanta.

Despite allowing a touchdown on a fumbled punt return and an interception return for a touchdown, the Saints took a 24-23 lead on Atlanta with one minute remaining in the game, when quarterback **Derek Carr** engineered a nine-play, 42-yard drive, ending on a one-yard rushing touchdown by running back **Alvin Kamara**.

The New Orleans defense hung tough throughout the contest, keeping the Falcons offense out of the end zone for all 60 minutes, forcing four Koo field goals, giving up only 14 first downs and allowing Atlanta to convert only 4-of-11 third down attempts. But winning the turnover battle, 2-1, with the take-aways on defense and special teams accounting for 14 Falcons points, gave Atlanta an edge in the contest.

In defense of their third Super Bowl title in five years, Kansas City has started off 4-0, with all four victories by seven points or less and withstanding significant injuries at the running back and wide receiver positions. QB **Patrick Mahomes** has taken on a massive role for a Chiefs offense that currently ranks 14th in the NFL in net yards per game (15th rushing and 11th passing), while the defense is tied for 15th (ranked eighth against the run and 2nd against the pass). The New Orleans offense led by Carr and Kamara, ranked ninth in the NFL (seventh rushing and 19th passing, while the defense ranks 17th (seventh against the run and 25th against the pass).

New Orleans is 5-7 all-time against the Chiefs, with the series very hotly contested with six being determined by seven points or less.

THE HEAD COACHES



Dennis Allen was hired as the 17th head coach in New Orleans Saints history on February 8, 2022. Now in his 29th year coaching and 23rd in the NFL, Allen has spent 14 seasons

in New Orleans in two separate stints, including six-and-a-half campaigns (2015-21) as the team's defensive coordinator prior to being promoted to head coach.

During his 23 years of coaching in the NFL, Allen has worked with 13 players who have combined for 26 Pro Bowl selections and he has also coached two *Associated Press* NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year winners and three members of the Pro Football Hall of Fame.

Allen's defenses have consistently been among the most productive in the NFL in a number of categories, including scoring defense, total yards allowed and sacks. The team's defensive play-caller since the middle of the 2015 season, the Saints are the only team in the National Football League to rank in the top ten in opponent points per game each of the past four seasons.

In 2023, Allen guided the Saints to win four of their last five games as the team turned in a 9-8 performance, narrowly missing the playoffs. New Orleans finished 5-3 at home, winning their last three at the Caesars Superdome and captured their last three division contests, including convincing victories over Tampa Bay and Atlanta to close the season.

Prior to rejoining the Saints in 2015, Allen served as head coach of the Oakland Raiders from 2012-14 and as defensive coordinator of the Denver Broncos in 2011.

Allen played safety at Texas A&M from 1992-95, where he started the final 21 games of his career before being signed as an undrafted free agent by the Buffalo Bills in 1996. Prior to entering the National Football League coaching ranks in 2002, Allen served as a graduate assistant at his alma mater from 1996-99 and as a secondary coach at the University of Tulsa from 2000-01. He earned a bachelor of business administration degree and a master's in kinesiology from Texas A&M.

Raised in Hurst, Texas, Allen and his wife Alisson have a daughter, Layla and a son, Garrison.



Andy Reid was named the 13th head coach in Kansas City Chiefs history on Jan. 7, 2013. He is in his 33rd season in the National Football League and his 26th campaign as an NFL head coach in 2024.

In 2023, the Chiefs earned their eighth consecutive AFC West title and sixth consecutive AFC Championship Game appearance and became one of just eight teams to win back-to-back Super Bowl titles in league history (LVII and LVIII). The Chiefs took down the 49ers, 25-22 in overtime to make history. With Reid's third Super Bowl win with the Chiefs, he is the only active head coach who has led teams to multiple Super Bowl wins. Reid now owns 26 post-season victories, second all-time only to Bill Belichick's 31 postseason wins.

In 2022, his tenth season with the Chiefs, Reid and company tallied 14 wins, tying the record set in 2020 under Reid's direction, and went undefeated against the AFC West for the first time since 2019. The Chiefs also hosted their fifth consecutive AFC Championship Game, an NFL record, and defeated the Cincinnati Bengals en route to their Super Bowl LVII victory over the Eagles.

In 2019, Reid led the Chiefs to their first Super Bowl appearance and victory in 50 years, bringing the Lombardi Trophy back to Kansas City for the first time since 1969. Additionally the Chiefs' 35-24 victory over the Tennessee Titans in the AFC Championship Game brought the Lamar Hunt Trophy to Kansas City for the first time ever.

In 2015, Reid also led the Chiefs to their first playoff win since 1993, with a win at Houston in the Wild Card round of the playoffs. In his first season in Kansas City in 2013, he helped orchestrate the franchise's best single-season turnaround as the Chiefs won 11 games and made the playoffs after going 2-14 the previous season.

Prior to joining the Chiefs, he served as the head coach of the Philadelphia Eagles for 14 years (1999-2012), earning NFL Coach of the Year honors three times. Reid compiled the best win total (140) and playoff victory total (10) in Eagles history. He captured six division titles and five trips to the NFC Championship Game. Reid was an assistant with Green Bay (1992-98) under Mike Holmgren.

SERIES HISTORY

The Kansas City Chiefs lead the series 6-5, following a 32-29 win by Kansas City at the Superdome on December 20, 2020. Six games in the series have been decided by a touchdown or less, including the last three as New Orleans seeks to snap a three-game losing streak in the series. New Orleans has posted a 3-2 record at GEHA Field at Arrowhead Stadium. This will be the second Monday Night Football meeting between the Saints and the Chiefs. New Orleans as a franchise made their debut on Monday Night Football in a 20-17 loss to Kansas City on September 25, 1972 at Arrowhead Stadium.

LAST MEETING

Chiefs 32, Saints 29; December 20, 2020 @ Mercedes-Benz Superdome - The Saints came up short in Drew Brees' return, falling 32-29 to the Kansas City Chiefs at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome.

The Saints franchise quarterback had missed the previous four games with broken ribs and a punctured lung. Brees and the Saints' offense got off to a rusty start with four three-and-outs and an interception to start. Brees was 0 for 6 in those possessions.

After the sluggish start, Brees completed 15-of-28 passes for 234 yards and three touchdowns, including a 51-yard strike to Emmanuel Sanders that helped set up a Taysom Hill touchdown.

Hill, the Saints' Swiss army knife, notched his sixth rushing touchdown of 2020 on the 1-yard scamper. It's the most rushing touchdowns by a Saints quarterback in a season, surpassing Archie Manning [1977].

New Orleans' defense made Chiefs QB Patrick Mahomes feel it all game. The Saints sacked Mahomes four times, led by DE Trey Hendrickson who registered two takedowns. Hendrickson recorded his third game of the season with at least 2.0 sacks. Hendrickson added five quarterback hits and a forced fumble.

"Played their hearts out," Saints coach Sean Payton said of the Saints defense postgame. "[I'm] proud of the effort."

LAST MEETING (CONT.)

Mahomes proved to be too much for New Orleans in the end, completing 26-of-47 passes for 254 yards and three scores. Chiefs running back and former Louisiana State University Tigers standout **Glyde Edwards-Helaire** led the team with 79 rushing yards on 14 carries [5.6 avg.] before leaving the game due to injury.

Saints defensive end Cameron Jordan was disqualified after throwing a punch with 13:50 remaining. The Chiefs dominated the time of possession, 41:14 to 18:46.

2024 GAME SUMMARIES

WEEK 1: Saints 47, Carolina Panthers 10; September 8, 2024 @ Caesars Superdome - The Saints, behind three **Derek Carr** touchdown passes, two rushing touchdowns and four **Blake Grupe** field goals, defeated the visiting Carolina Panthers, 47-10, at the Caesars Superdome.

The Saints jumped out to a 30-0 lead, scored on their first nine possessions [tying a club record for scores on consecutive possessions] and held the ball for 36:39 in time of possession en route to the highest scoring total and most lopsided opening day result in team history. New Orleans won their sixth consecutive season opener, a club record and the current longest opener winning streak in the NFL.

The New Orleans defense also displayed their mettle, allowing only 193 total net yards of offense by the Panthers and held the Panthers to just one of ten third downs.

The Saints defense recorded three takeaways and CB **Alontae Taylor** became the first Saints defensive back to record three sacks in a contest, but fans were excited by the debut of a new-look offense that helped the Saints control the clock with a rushing game that gained 180 yards and two touchdowns largely behind **Alvin Kamara's** 83 yards. Carr completed 19-of-23 passes [82.6 pct.] for 200 yards with three touchdown passes, zero interceptions and a 142.5 passer rating. The New Orleans defense harassed Carolina QB **Bryce Young** all day, as he completed only 13-of-30 passes for 161 yards with two interceptions and a 32.8 passer rating.

- With the victory, the Saints improved to 23-35 in season openers and extend their club-record winning streak of season openers to six straight, currently the longest streak in the National Football league.
- WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed** led New Orleans with 73 receiving yards on three receptions [24.3 avg.] with one touchdown reception from 59 yards out, the longest play of the game. Including 60 punt return yards, sparked by a 47-yard runback and a 33-yard kickoff return, Shaheed finished with 163 all-purpose yards to start the season.
- Carr connected with two of his tight ends, **Juwan Johnson** and **Foster Moreau** for touchdowns.
- 17 players made their Saints debuts: T **Taliese Fuaga**, G **Lucas Patrick**, LB **Willie Gay Jr.**, DB **Will Harris**, QB **Jake Haener**, WR **Cedrick Wilson Jr.**, CB **Kool-Aid McKinstry**, WR **Bub Means**, CB **Rico Payton**, P **Matthew Hayball**, LB **Khaleke Hudson**, LB **Anfernee Orji**, OL **Oli Udoh**, WR **Mason Tipton**, DTs **Kendal Vickers** and **Khristian Boyd** and DE **Chase Young**.
- With 83 yards rushing and five receptions for 27 yards, Kamara's 110 total yards from scrimmage gave him his 50th career game of at least 100 yards from scrimmage.

2024 GAME SUMMARIES

WEEK 2: Saints 44, Dallas Cowboys 19; September 15, 2024 @ AT&T Stadium - The Saints posted an impressive road victory against Dallas behind the powerful offensive firepower of RB **Alvin Kamara**, the arm of QB **Derek Carr**, the hands of WRs **Chris Olave** and **Rashid Shaheed** and two interceptions by the defense.

The Saints struck first on the opening drive as Carr led the offense down the field on a sequence ending with **Kamara** rushing for a five-yard touchdown. At the conclusion of Dallas' first drive, K **Brandon Aubrey** booted a 52-yard field goal. New Orleans struck right back for their second score of the first quarter on a 70-yard pass play from Carr to Shaheed to put New Orleans up 14-3.

Leading 35-16 at halftime, the Cowboys got the ball out of the second half and New Orleans moved Dallas out of the red zone in the first drive, when DT **Bryan Bresee** sacked QB **Dak Prescott** and forced him to fumble before it was recovered by Dallas at the New Orleans 22-yard line, forcing a 40-yard field goal. On New Orleans' next 13-play, 70-yard drive, Kamara capped things off with a seven-yard touchdown, his fourth score of the day.

In the fourth quarter, Carr was intercepted on a tipped pass, but on the next play, New Orleans got the ball back on an interception by S **Tyrann Mathieu**, his second takeaway of the season. On the ensuing drive, New Orleans closed out the scoring in the contest with a 26-yard field goal by K **Blake Grupe**. Carr completed 11-of-16 passes for 243 yards with two touchdown throws and one interception, while scoring one rushing touchdown for a 125.0 passer rating. Kamara led the club in rushing with a game-high 115 yards on 20 carries with three touchdowns to go with two receptions for 65 yards, including a career-long 57-yard scoring grab on a screen pass. Shaheed led the Saints in receiving with four grabs for 96 yards with the deep touchdown, reaching the end zone in his third consecutive contest dating back to 2023.

The Saints defense harassed Prescott, sacking him three times and forcing two interceptions. CB **Alontae Taylor** led the team with a career-high nine tackles, while CB **Paulson Adebo** had his first interception of the season and DE **Carl Granderson** picked up 1.5 sacks.

- The win marked the first time the Saints have won in Dallas since a 34-31 overtime victory on December 23, 2012.
- Carr's two touchdown passes moved him into a tie for 26th all-time with Boomer Esiason. With his next scoring pass, he will move into a tie for 25th with Tony Romo.
- Shaheed's career-long 70-yard touchdown reception gives him eight career touchdowns on offense and special teams.
- Mathieu's interception was the 34th of his career since coming into the league in 2013, the most in the NFL over that time.
- A stingy Saints run defense held the Cowboys to 68 yards rushing on 21 carries (3.2 avg.).
- The 91 points by New Orleans in their first two games are tied for the second-most in NFL history through the first two games of a season, behind the Saints' 93 point total in 2009.



WEEK 3: Philadelphia Eagles 15, Saints 12; September 22, 2024 @ Caesars Superdome - Philadelphia S **Reed Blankenship** intercepted Saints QB **Derek Carr** with 48 seconds left to preserve a 15-12 win over New Orleans in the Caesars Superdome.

The Saints had overcome an unsuccessful fourth-and-one conversion attempts and a 65-yard touchdown run by Eagles RB **Saquon Barkley** to take the lead in the fourth quarter with just over two minutes left, 12-7, with a field goal and a 13-yard touchdown connection from Carr and WR **Chris Olave**.

However, upon the Eagles getting the ball back, Philadelphia QB **Jalen Hurts** completed a pass to TE **Dallas Goedert** for a 61-yard gain and Barkley punch in a touchdown from four yards in. The Eagles improved to 2-1, while the Saints fell to 2-1.

Carr completed 14-of-25 passes for 142 yards with one touchdown and one interception. Olave had six receptions for 86 yards, including a 13-yard touchdown catch. RB **Alvin Kamara** rushed for 87 yards and caught three passes for 40 yards from 127 total yards from scrimmage.

DE **Carl Granderson** had 1.5 sacks and a forced fumble and DT **Bryan Bresee** tied a career-high with two quarterback takedowns. S **Tyrann Mathieu** had an interception, giving him takeaways in four straight games for the first time in his career dating back to the 2023 campaign. CB **Paulson Adebo** led the team with a career-high ten solo tackles and one pass breakup.

- The loss snapped a four-game winning streak, and a four-game home win streak.
- For the third consecutive game, the Saints scored on their first offensive possession with the Grupe field goal. It marked the first time since Weeks 17 and 18 of the 2022 season and the 2023 season opener, that the Saints scored on their opening possession in three consecutive games.
- Mathieu's interception was the 35th of his career since coming into the league in 2013. He and Minnesota's Harrison Smith are tied as the NFL's interception leaders among active players.
- Dating back to Week 17 of the 2023 season, New Orleans has won the takeaway battle in five consecutive contests.

WEEK 4: Atlanta Falcons 26, Saints 24; September 29, 2024 @ Mercedes-Benz Stadium - Despite several significant injuries going into the contest and in-game, the Saints took the Falcons to the limit before dropping a 26-24 heartbreaker at Mercedes-Benz Stadium.

Atlanta kicker **Younghoe Koo's** 58-yard field goal with two seconds left was the difference. New Orleans rebounded from a fumbled punt return for a touchdown early in the first quarter to reach the end zone on rushing touchdowns by TE **Taysom Hill** on their first two offensive possessions, his first two scores of the season, before departing with an abdomen injury.

Atlanta took the lead back in the second quarter at 17-14 on a 53-yard Koo field goal and a 44-yard **Troy Andersen** 44-yard interception return for a touchdown. Koo added to the scoring with a 44-yard field goal midway through the third quarter and then **Blake Grupe** and Koo traded field goals with the Falcons taking the end for the majority of the third and fourth quarters until QB **Derek Carr** engineered a nine-play, 42-yard drive ending with a one-yard touchdown run by RB **Alvin Kamara** with one minute left to pull ahead, 24-23. But Atlanta rallied, as the Falcons gained 30 yards on a pass interference penalty to set up Koo's 58-yard kick.

WEEK 2: NFC Offensive Player of the Week, FedEx Ground Player of the Week and LFG (Tom Brady-FOX) Player of the Game Award - RB Alvin Kamara Made a significant impact in the running game and passing game in New Orleans' 44-19 win at the Dallas Cowboys. Kamara carried 20 times for 115 yards [5.8 avg.] with three touchdowns and caught two passes for 65 yards, including a career-long 57-yard touchdown.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR

- With a Saints win, New Orleans would improve their record in the all-time series against Kansas City to 6-7 and their record at Arrowhead Stadium to 4-2.
- With a Saints win, New Orleans would even their overall record on Monday Night Football to 26-26 and improve their road record on the NFL's biggest showcase to 8-8. A win would also even their overall record on prime time to 55-55.
- A Saints win would improve Head Coach **Dennis Allen's** record against Kansas City to 3-2.
- New Orleans QB **Derek Carr** has 248 career touchdown passes, tied for 26th all-time in National Football League history with Tony Romo. Carolina Panthers signal caller Andy Dalton is tied with Drew Bledsoe for 24th with 251. With two touchdowns, Carr would have the opportunity to have 250 career touchdown passes as well as move up in the rankings.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR

- Carr is ranked 25th all-time with 39,924 passing yards. With 76 passing yards, he will become the 25th player in National Football League history with 40,000. With 315 passing yards, he would tie Johnny Unitas (Pro Football Hall of Fame Class of 1979) for 24th and with 316 would surpass Unitas. Carr would become the seventh National Football League quarterback to reach 40,000 career passing yards in their 11th season, joining Drew Brees, Peyton Manning, Matt Ryan, Dan Marino, Matthew Stafford and Russell Wilson.

- LB **Demario Davis** has 693 career tackles as a Saint since 2018, needing seven to reach 700 for his Black and Gold career.

- TE **Taysom Hill**, has 40 career touchdowns, tenth in club records. With one more touchdown, he would tie RB Pierre Thomas for ninth and with two would take sole possession of ninth.

- DE **Cameron Jordan** has had a sack against 28-of-31 NFL opponents. if he has a sack against Kansas City on Monday night total, it will reach 29 opponents for a total.

- Jordan's 27 multi-sack games are tied for first in franchise record books with LB Rickey Jackson, needing one more to become the franchise's all-time leader. His six three-sack games also ties Jackson for first in club history, needing one more to become the franchise leader.

- Jordan has played in 213 career games, tied for 29th all-time among defensive linemen with Steve McMichael (Pro Football Hall of Fame Class of 2024) and Henry Thomas for 29th. On Monday night, he will appear in his 214th career game and move into a tie for 27th with Vonnie Holliday and Domata Peko.

- RB **Alvin Kamara's** team-record 84 touchdowns are tied for 59th place in NFL record books with Pro Football Hall of Fame WR Calvin Johnson (Class of 2021), Andre Rison and Herschel Walker. With one, he would move into a tie for 57th with Pro Football Hall of Fame WR Tommy McDonald (Class of 1998) and Mark Clayton and with two, he would move into

a tie RBs Ottis Anderson and Ezeiel Elliott (Elliott and the Cowboys play on Sunday Night Football), WRs Hines Ward and Paul Warfield (Pro Football Hall of Fame Class of 1993).

- Kamara's club-record 59 career rushing touchdowns are tied for 56th place all-time with former Saints teammate Latavius Murray. With one rushing touchdown, he would move into a tie for 53rd place all-time with Terrell Davis (Pro Football Hall of Fame Class of 2017), Ahman Green and Brandon Jacobs. and with two rushing touchdowns, he would move into a a tie for 50th with O. J. Simpson (Pro Football Hall of Fame Class of 1985), Walker and DeAngelo Williams.

- Kamara has 10,584 career total yards from scrimmage, currently ranked 99th place all-time in NFL record books. With 14 yards, he would move into a tie for 98th place with RB/WR Charley Taylor (Pro Football Hall of Fame Class of 1984) and with 15 would move into sole possession of 98th. With 23, he would move into a tie for 97th with WR A.J. Green and with 24 would surpass Green. With 78, he would move into a tie for 96th with Keyshawn Johnson and with 97 would surpass Johnson. . With 105, he would tie Pro Football Hall of Fame WR/HB Bobby Mitchell for 95th and with 106, would take sole possession of 95th.

- Kamara's 522 career receptions are ranked fifth in club record books. With one catch on Monday night, he would tie WR Joe Horn (2000-06) for fourth in club record books and with two grabs, he would surpass Horn for sole possession of fourth place. With ten grabs, he would tie WR Eric Martin for third place and with 11 catches, he would take sole possession of third.

- Kamara's seven career contests with double-digit receptions are tied for second all-time in National Football League records among running backs with the Washington Commanders' Austin Ekeler. With double-digit receptions on Monday night, he would take sole possession of second.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR

- Kamara will play in his 106th career regular season game on Monday night and move into a tie for 45th on the club's all-time list for games played with DE Joe Johnson, OL Jake Kupp and DT David Onyemata.
- Kamara has 4,393 career receiving yards, ranked 19th in NFL record books among running backs. With 65 receiving yards, he would move into a tie with Thurman Thomas (Pro Football Hall of Fame Class of 2007) for 18th and with 66, would take sole possession of 18th.
- Kamara's 24 career receiving touchdowns are ranked 11th in club record books. With one touchdown grab, he would move into a tie for ninth with former Black and Gold WRs Quinn Early and Robert Meachem and with two, he would move into sole possession of ninth.
- Kamara's 24 career receiving touchdowns are tied for 19th all-time among NFL running backs with Clem Daniels and Ronnie Harmon. With one, he would move into a tie for 18th with James White and with two, he would move into a tie for 16th with Tim Brown and Larry Gannon.
- Kamara is tied with RB Brian Westbrook and Pro Football Hall of Fame flanker/halfback Lenny Moore (Class of 1975) for 12 games with both a rushing and receiving touchdown. A performance with a rushing and receiving touchdown on Sunday would elevate him into sole possession of third.
- Kamara's seven career two-point conversions are tied for first place in NFL record books with Pro Football Hall of Fame RB Marshall Faulk (Class of 2011). With his next two-point conversion, Kamara would become the league's all-time recordholder.
- CB **Marshon Lattimore's** 15 career interceptions are tied for eighth place in club record books with S Brett Maxie, S Marcus Williams and DB Ernie Jackson. With one interception, he would move into a tie for seventh place with CB Toi Cook and with two, he would move into a tie for sixth place with CB Johnnie Poe.
- S **Tyrann Mathieu** is tied for first among active players with 35 career interceptions with Minnesota Vikings S Harrison Smith. With one pick on Monday night, he would potentially surpass Smith and become the NFL's active leader (note-Smith and the Vikings play at 8:30 a.m. CT on Sunday in London).
- WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed** has 609 career punt return yards, ranked ninth in club record books. With two punt return yards, Shaheed would surpass Rich Mauti and move into eighth place, with 49 he would surpass Mel Gray and move into seventh and with 63, he would surpass Darren Sproles and move into sixth..
- CB **Alontae Taylor's** team-leading 3.5 sacks are the second-highest total by a Saints cornerback behind Alex Molden's four in 1997. With a split sack, Taylor will tie Molden's mark for Saints corners and with a whole takedown, he would surpass it.
- LS **Zach Wood** will play in his 120th career game on Monday night and will move into a tie with LB Vaughan Johnson for 32nd.

Following the road contest against the Chiefs, New Orleans will return to the Caesars Superdome to

The Saints lead the regular season series, 40-24, holding the highest winning percentage (62.5) against an opponent they have played at least 17 times. New Orleans has a 21-12 record against Tampa Bay in contests played at the Caesars Superdome. On December 31, 2023, the Saints defeated the Buccaneers 23-13 at Raymond James Stadium to split the season series and move into a tie for first place in the NFC South.

TEAM NOTES

EVANS SELECTED TO SAINTS RING OF HONOR

Former Saints G Jahri Evans will be inducted into the club's Ring of Honor during a halftime ceremony of the team's contest against the Cleveland Browns on November 17.

Evans, 6-4, 318, was originally a fourth round draft pick (108th overall) of the Saints in 2006 out of Bloomsburg and developed into an anchor for one of the most dominant offenses in NFL history during his tenure with the Saints. The Philadelphia, Pa. native started all 169 regular season games he played in at right guard and all of the team's ten postseason contests during that period, including all three during the 2009 campaign when the Saints captured Super Bowl XLIV.

A five-time Associated Press All-Pro (2009-13), Evans was selected first-team four times, twice as much as any other Saint. Evans was selected to six straight Pro Bowls (2009-14) and was named to the Pro Football Hall of Fame's 2010's All-Decade Team. During his 11-year tenure, the Saints were ranked first in the NFL in total offense (net yards per game) six times (2006, 2008-09, 2011, 2014 and 2016) and in scoring (points per game) twice (2008-09). The 274 sacks surrendered by the Saints offensive line from 2006-16 were the lowest total in the NFL over the period and the unit was recognized twice (2009 and 2011) as the winner of the Madden Pro-Tector Offensive Line Award.

Evans closed out his playing career starting 14 games at right guard for the Green Bay Packers in 2017, finishing with 183 total games played/started. A Pro Football Hall of Fame semifinalist in 2023 and finalist in 2024, Evans began his coaching career as an offensive assistant for the Saints in 2023.

Gary Kubiak was head coach of the Houston Texans from 2006-13 and the Denver Broncos from 2015-16, including the Super Bowl 50 champions. Brother Klay, serves as the 49ers passing game specialist. Brother Klein works in the Dallas Cowboys player personnel department.

Vice President/Asst. General Manager-College Personnel Jeff Ireland - Stepson of Chiefs Hall of Fame linebacker/center E.J. Holub. Grandson of Philadelphia Eagles running back and Chicago Bears personnel executive Jim Parmer.

National Scout Terry Wooden - Brother, Jojo is Senior Director of Player Personnel for the Las Vegas Raiders.

QB Derek Carr - Older brother, David was the No. 1 overall pick in the 2002 NFL Draft by the Houston Texans and played quarterback in the league for 11 seasons with Houston, Carolina, the New York Giants and San Francisco. Uncle, Lon Boyett, played tight end for Tampa Bay, the Raiders and San Francisco.

LB Demario Davis - Cousin of the late Steve McNair, the standout quarterback for the Tennessee Titans [1995-2005] and Baltimore Ravens [2006-07].

QB Taysom Hill - Brother-in-law, David Nixon, played linebacker and on special teams for the Oakland Raiders [2009], Houston Texans [2010] and St. Louis Rams [2010-11].

DB Jordan Howden - Cousin, Saladin Martin, played cornerback with the New York Jets [1980] and San Francisco 49ers [1981].

TE Juwan Johnson - Brother, George, played defensive end for eight years in the NFL with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, Minnesota Vikings, Detroit Lions and Saints.

DE Cameron Jordan - Father, Steve, had a prolific 13-year career at tight end for the Minnesota Vikings, with six Pro Bowl selections, being inducted into their Ring of Honor.

C/G Erik McCoy - Cousin of former Dolphins and Buccaneers running back Jorvorski Lane.

LB Nephi Sewell - One brother Penei, is a member of the Detroit Lions after getting selected seventh overall in the 2021 NFL Draft. Another brother, Noah, was selected by the Chicago Bears in the fifth round of the 2023 NFL Draft.

Practice Squad WR Equanimeous St. Brown - Younger brother, Amon-Ra, plays wide receiver for the Lions.

LB Pete Werner - Father, Greg, played nine games at right end and on special teams for the New York Jets in 1989 and went to training camp with the Philadelphia Eagles in 1990.

WR Cedrick Wilson Jr. - Father, Cedrick Sr., is a former NFL wideout, who played for seven years in the league, including a Super Bowl championship with the Pittsburgh Steelers.

Area Scout Joey Vitt - Father, Joe Vitt, is a longtime NFL assistant coach, who served as assistant head coach/linebackers of the Saints from 2006-16 and also had coaching stints with the Seattle Seahawks, Colts, Los Angeles/St. Louis Rams, Kansas City Chiefs and Jets.

Area Scout Matt Phillips - Father, Ted, worked in the Chicago Bears front office from 1983-2022, including serving his last 24 years as team president.

Of the players on the team's roster, California [quarterback Derek Carr, defensive ends Isaiah Foskey and Carl Granderson, quarterback Jake Haener, defensive back Jordan Howden, running back Jordan Mims, wide receiver Chris Olave, fullback Adam Prentice, wide receiver/return specialist Rashid Shaheed and running back Jamaal Williams] claims the most with ten.

ROSTER ROLL CALL

On the Saints active roster as of October 1, 35 were on the active roster, a reserve list of the practice squad at the end of the 2023 season. Among newcomers, the roster includes nine unrestricted free agents, one trade acquisition, six draft picks, four rookie free agents.

Of the players, 24 have less than four years of previous NFL experience, including ten rookies. The following is a breakdown of New Orleans' roster by years of experience (year entering): 14 years - 1, 13 years - 1, 12 years - 1, 11 years - 1, 8 years - 6, 7 years - 3, 6 years - 5, 5 years - 5, 4 years - 5, 3 years - 5, 2 years - 7, 1 year - 2, rookies - 10.

HIGHER EDUCATION

39 colleges and universities are represented on the Saints' 53-man roster. Of that total, nine are represented by multiple Saints, four from Ohio State, three from Fresno State and two from BYU, Mississippi State, LSU, Notre Dame, Tennessee, Northern Iowa, Oregon, South Carolina and Vanderbilt.

TURNOVER RATIO LEADER

After finishing 31st in the NFL at -11 in 2022, New Orleans finished the 2023 season tied for third in turnover differential at +11 and ranked second in the NFC. The Saints won the turnover battle in eight games in 2023 and posted a 6-2 record in those contests. In 2024, they are tied for fourth at +3 through the first four games, while winning the battle in each contest, including having one interception by CB Paulson Adebo on Sunday.

BUCKING THE ODDS

The Saints have a long tradition of finding players as free agents signed after the draft that make an impact immediately or after developing their careers initially on the practice squad. Several undrafted Saints on the roster play key roles on offense, defense and special teams, including four undrafted rookies who are on the 53-man roster out of the preseason.

Over the past 21 years, the Saints (2018-22: DB **J.T. Gray**, WR/RS **Deonte Harty** and WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed**) and San Diego/Los Angeles Chargers (2003: G **Kris Dielman**, TE **Antonio Gates** and WR **Kasim Osgood**) are the only two teams to have three players signed as undrafted free agents be selected to a Pro Bowl for the team that originally signed them.

In 2023, Shaheed was no longer a secret around the National Football League, as he appeared in 15 games with six starts and caught 46 passes for 719 yards (club-best 15.6 avg.) with five touchdown grabs to tie for the team lead, including seven receptions of 40-or-more yards, while also carrying seven times for 37 yards and ranking second in the NFC and third in the NFL in punt return average (13.6) and tenth in the league in all-purpose yards (1,479), despite missing two contests with a quad injury. Tying for the team lead with six total touchdowns including a punt return touchdown, Shaheed was selected as both Pro Bowl starter as a return specialist and as a first-team Associated Press All-Pro as a punt returner.

An integral part of both the team's offense and return game, Shaheed and the Saints agreed to a contract extension prior to the start of training camp. Through four games, Shaheed has 15 receptions for 252 yards (16.8 avg.) with touchdowns of 59- and 70 yards, carried five times for 27 yards, returned six punts for 77 yards and four kickoffs for 108 yards. Rasheed's 15.0 punt return average ranks third in the NFL and his 464 all-purpose yards rank sixth. Overall, since coming into the league in 2022, his 13 catches of 40 yards or more rank second in the NFL.

Originally signed as an undrafted free agent in 2018, spending part of his rookie season on the practice squad, Gray's 73 special teams tackles since 2019 rank first in the National Football League, as he has been selected as both an *Associated Press* first-team All-Pro and Pro Bowler. In 2023, the special teams captain finished the season with 11 coverage stops to lead the team and tie for 12th in the league, despite missing three contests with injuries. In 2024, he is ranked second on the team with eight stops and had a blocked punt on Sept. 22 vs. Philadelphia.

TE **Juwan Johnson** first led Saints tight ends with four touchdown receptions in 2021, converting to the position that offseason after playing wideout in college and as a rookie in 2020, signed as an undrafted free agent from Oregon. In 2022, he led the Black and Gold tight ends in receiving with 42 grabs for 508 yards with a club-best and career-high seven touchdowns, tied for third at the position in the NFL. Johnson led the team's tight ends with 37 grabs for 368 yards with four touchdown grabs in 2023. Johnson has led the Saints with 12 receiving touchdowns over the past three seasons, ranked fourth over that period among league National Football League tight ends. In 2024, Johnson quickly recovered from foot surgery in June and has played in all four games, recording four receptions for 39 yards with one touchdown.

DE **Carl Granderson** joined the club in 2019 as an undrafted free agent out of Wyoming and has appeared in 75 regular season games with 28 starts, posting 194 tackles (113 solo), 26 sacks for a loss of 166.5 yards, two passes defended, four forced fumbles and two recoveries. In 2023, Granderson earned the starting right end position and posted a career-high 78 tackles (44 solo), led the team with a career-best 8.5 sacks for a loss of 55 yards, defended one pass and forced a fumble and recovered one. Granderson's 78 stops ranked fifth in the National Football League among defensive linemen and were the most by a Saints lineman since 2004. He has opened all four games in 2024 and has 15 tackles (ten solo), three sacks and one forced fumble.

After originally signing as an undrafted free agent out of Vanderbilt in 2023, where he led the Commodores in tackles in each of his final three seasons, LB **Anfernee Orji** received the opportunity to see extensive snaps in practice in training camp due to injuries to teammates Demario Davis and Pete Werner. He leads the team with nine coverage stops and has also added one defensive tackle.

After originally signing with New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Utah in 2022, LB **Nephi Sewell** has become a valued member of the special teams units in his first two seasons, while also providing depth on defense. In his first full season in 2023 on the active roster, Sewell totaled five coverage stops and one forced fumble on special teams and ten defensive tackles. Sewell is currently on Reserve/Physically Unable to Perform, recovering from a knee injury suffered in Week 17 of the 2023 campaign, but expected to return to practice soon.

TE **Dallin Holker** was signed by New Orleans after a standout graduate transfer campaign at Colorado State, where he posted 64 receptions for 767 yards with six touchdowns, the highest total of yardage and scoring grabs in the college regular season by an FBS tight end. Holker's performance in the off-season and training camp secured a roster spot behind Johnson, Taysom Hill and Foster Moreau.

New Orleans signed P **Matthew Hayball** out of Vanderbilt following the NFL Draft. The West Adelaide, Australia native finished as Vandy’s all-time leader in punting average (46.5) and was a consensus second-team All-American in 2023, when he ranked seventh nationally in net (43.1). Hayball won a training camp competition to secure the job. In the first four games, he has punted ten times with a 39.8 net punting average.

CB **Rico Payton** signed a college free agent contract in the spring, playing his final four years at Pittsburg State. As a senior in 2023, the St. Louis native recorded 35 tackles with four interceptions and 15 passes defensed. Payton secured a roster spot with his performance in training camp practices and preseason games, leading the team with five passes defensed and adding seven defensive tackles and one coverage stop in three contests. Payton has contributed on both defense and special teams in the first four games with one pass breakup and one coverage stop.

WR **Mason Tipton** stuck on the 53-man roster after showing bright spots in training camp practices, following a college career at Yale, where he posted 132 receptions for 1,067 yards with 19 TDs. In 2024, he has four receptions for 23 yards.

QUARTERBACKS

DEREK CARR



On March 6, 2023, the Saints agreed to terms with Derek Carr on a four-year contract to solidify the quarterback position. He spent the first nine seasons of his NFL career with the Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders. Originally selected in the second round [36th overall] of the 2014 NFL Draft by the Raiders out of Fresno State, the Bakersfield, Calif. native has started all 163 career regular season games he has played in, the most starts at the position over that time, completing 3,648-of-5,606 passes [65.1 pct.] for 39,924 yards with 248 touchdown passes, 110 interceptions and a 92.6 passer rating, while adding 907 rushing yards and seven touchdowns. Since entering the league in 2014, Carr ranks first in the NFL in completions, second in passing yardage and sixth in passing touchdowns. He became the third quarterback in NFL history to pass for 3,000-plus yards in each of his first ten seasons, joining Pro Football Hall of Fame signal-caller Peyton Manning and Russell Wilson. He is just the fourth player in NFL history to reach 35,000 passing yards in his first nine seasons and has completed 313 passes of 25+ yards since he entered the league in 2014, second-most in the NFL over that span.

Carr started all 17 games in 2023 and completed 375-of-548 passes [68.4 pct.] for 3,878 yards with 25 touchdowns, eight interceptions and a 97.7 passer rating. He finished his first season in Black and Gold ranked second in the NFL in fourth quarter passer rating [106.9], sixth in completion percentage, seventh in completions and tenth in TD passes and passer rating.

In 2024, Carr has completed 72-of-100 passes [72.0 pct.] for 648 yards, six touchdowns, only three interceptions and a 103.9 passer rating. Carr ranks fifth in the NFL in yards per attempt [8.24], sixth in touchdown percentage [6.0], is tied for fifth in touchdown passes, ranked third in completion percentage and eighth in passer rating.

RUNNING BACKS

ALVIN KAMARA

A talented runner and receiver who was selected by the Saints in the third round of the 2017 NFL Draft out of the University of Tennessee, Kamara enjoyed an outstanding rookie campaign. He ranked first on the club and sixth in the NFL in yards from scrimmage (1,554), second on the team in rushing and receiving, carrying 120 times for 728 yards (6.1 avg) with eight TDs and a two-point conversion, catching 81 passes for 826 yards (10.2 avg) with five touchdowns and one kickoff return for a touchdown in the regular season finale. Kamara set a club rookie record with 14 total scores, tied for second in the NFL and finished first in the league in yards per carry.

Kamara was the first Saints offensive rookie selected to the Pro Bowl since Rueben Mayes (1986), as an *Associated Press* second team All-Pro (flex), the club's first rookie All-Pro since 1993. He was also named *The Sporting News* NFL Rookie of the Year and AP NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year.

Kamara is off to a spectacular start in 2024, carrying 80 times for 362 yards (4.5 avg.) with five touchdowns and catching 17 passes for 174 yards (10.2 avg.) with a career-long 57-yard touchdown. With a nose for the end zone, he is ranked first in the NFL in total yards from scrimmage (536), tied for first in total touchdowns and rushing touchdowns and ranked fourth in rushing.

In the Sept. 15 win at Dallas, Kamara had 180 total yards from scrimmage, including 115 rushing and four touchdowns, three on the ground to earn NFC Offensive Player of the Week honors.

In 105 career regular season games with 74 starts, Kamara has carried 1,395 times for 6,191 yards (4.4 avg.) with 59 touchdowns and has caught 522 passes for 4,393 yards (8.4 avg.) with 24 touchdowns. Kamara is the franchise's all-time leader in rushing touchdowns, total touchdowns (84), total yards from scrimmage (10,584) and all-purpose yardage (11,242) and is ranked second in rushing yards.

SCRIMMAGE LEADER

Since entering the NFL in 2017, Kamara ranks second in the league in total yards from scrimmage (10,465), only one of four players to have 10,000 over that period. TEN OF ONE OF EACH

With the one rushing TD, two receiving TD performance in an Oct. 30, 2022 victory over Las Vegas, Kamara along with Christian McCaffrey on the same day became the first two players in NFL history to have at least ten games with at least one rushing touchdown and one receiving TD in their first six seasons. Only Marshall Faulk (15), McCaffrey (13) and Bryan Westbrook (12) have more in league history.

67 THROUGH 70

Kamara in his first game returning from a knee injury in the December 12, 2021 30-9 win at the New York Jets rushed 27 times for 120 yards with one touchdown and caught 4 passes for 25 yards. JAMAAL WILLIAMS

This seven-year NFL veteran was signed by the New Orleans Saints as an unrestricted free agent in the 2023 offseason. In eight NFL seasons with Green Bay [2017-20], Detroit [2021-22] and New Orleans [2023-], Williams has played in 107 games with 44 starts, carrying 1,044 times for 4,045 yards with 32 touchdowns, also catching 182 passes for 1,282 yards with eight touchdowns for 5,327 total yards from scrimmage. Williams is part of a formidable rushing trio with Kamara and his former college teammate, Taysom Hill.

JORDAN MIMS

A former standout at Fresno State, where he rushed for 3,285 yards and 37 TDs, Mims joined the Saints practice squad after going to training camp with Buffalo and contributed on special teams in two games for the Black and Gold in 2023. 6-0, 205, Mims will contribute in the run game and on special teams after earning a roster spot and had his first coverage tackle, Sept. 22, vs. Philadelphia..

WIDE RECEIVERS

CHRIS OLAVE

The 11th overall pick in the 2022 NFL Draft out of Ohio State, this talented wideout made an immediate impact as a rookie, catching 72 passes for 1,042 yards [14.5 avg.] and four TDs, leading the team in receptions, receiving average and receiving yards, while earning September NFL Offensive Rookie of the Month honors as the 24th player since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger to record 1,000 receiving yards as a rookie. Olave became the third Saints rookie to reach 1,000 receiving yards and the first Saints rookie since WR Danny Abramowicz [1967] to lead the team in receiving, receiving yardage and yards per catch in his first campaign.

In 2023, Olave took the next step in his career, leading the team in receiving and receiving yardage for the second consecutive season with 87 receptions for 1,123 yards and five touchdowns, tying for the team lead. The Southern California native became the seventh Saint with 85 receptions in a season and the sixth with 1,100 receiving yards in a season. In 2024, he leads the team in receiving with 20 grabs for 265 yards with one touchdown through the first four games, including a standout performance Sunday at Atlanta of eight catches for 87 yards.

BY THE NUMBERS

2 - With 72 receptions for 1,042 yards (14.5 avg.), Olave joined Danny Abramowicz [1967], as the second Saints rookie to lead the team in receiving, receiving yardage and yards per catch.

RASHID SHAHEED

This third-year wideout has made his mark for New Orleans in both the passing game and the return game, where he was selected to the Pro Bowl and voted as an AP All-Pro in 2023. In addition to the return duties in 2023, Shaheed enjoyed a breakout season on offense, when he recorded 46 receptions for 719 yards (15.6 avg.) with five touchdown grabs, finishing 12th in the NFL in yards per catch.

Enjoying a breakout campaign, Shaheed has recorded 25 receptions for 252 yards (16.8 avg.) with two touchdowns, carried five times for 27 yards, brought back six punts for 77 yards (12.8 avg.) and returned a four kickoffs for 108 yards (27.0 avg.)

A.T. PERRY

New Orleans selected this big-bodied, sure-handed target in the sixth round of the 2023 NFL Draft out of Wake Forest. At 6-5, 205, the South Florida native possesses the ability to make the tough catch in traffic. During his college career, Perry set numerous Wake Forest receiving records, including a program-best 28 touchdowns. In his last two seasons, he became the first player in Demon Deacons history to have multiple 1,000-yard receiving seasons and shattered the single-season touchdown grab mark with 15 in 2021.

Perry moved into the wide receiver rotation at mid-season and in the last eight contests of the 2023 season, recorded 12 grabs for 246 yards (20.5 avg.) with four touchdowns, including two scoring receptions in the season finale victory over Atlanta.

GEDRICK WILSON JR.

This seventh-year wideout was signed by New Orleans to a two-year contract at the start of free agency to compete for snaps on offense and to provide veteran leadership to the wideout room. In 72 regular season games with seven starts, he has recorded 102 receptions for 1,272 yards with 11 touchdowns. In 2023, the Memphis native posted 22 catches for 296 yards with three touchdowns, adding three grabs for 37 yards in the postseason.

TIGHT ENDS

TAYSOM HILL

Hill has brought unheralded versatility to the Saints offense and special teams. A participant on special teams since midseason in 2017, as well as a signal-caller and as a runner and receiver, Hill has played in 100 regular season games with 44 starts at several positions. He has carried 412 times for 2,236 yards, the most by a Saint not to play running back, with 29 touchdowns, ranked fifth in club records. In the passing game, he has caught 78 passes for 758 yards with 11 touchdowns, completed 191-of-298 passes (64.1 pct.) for 2,348 yards with 11 touchdowns, returned 19 kickoffs for 447 yards, made 15 special teams tackles and blocked one punt.

In 2023, Hill ranked second on the team in rushing with 81 carries for 401 yards (5.0 avg.) with four touchdowns, caught a career-high 33 passes for 291 yards with two TDs, completed six-of-11 passes for 83 yards with one TD and a 109.3 passer rating, returned a kickoff 18 yards and had two special teams tackles.

RENAISSANCE MAN

Hill turned in an all-around standout performance in the November 5, 2023 win over the Chicago Bears, where he led the team in rushing, carrying 11 times for 52 yards (4.7 avg.), completed a three-yard touchdown pass to tight end Juwan Johnson and caught four passes for 13 yards with one touchdown.

JUWAN JOHNSON

The former Penn State and Oregon wideout joined the New Orleans Saints in 2020 following the NFL Draft and transitioned to tight end his second season in 2021. In 2022, the New Jersey native had a breakout campaign as he appeared in 16 games with 12 starts and finished with 42 receptions for 508 yards and a team-best seven touchdown grabs. Johnson was tied for third among National Football League tight ends in receiving touchdowns. Overall, Johnson’s 15 touchdown grabs since 2021 lead the team.

In 13 games with 11 starts in 2023, Johnson finished with 37 receptions for 368 yards and four touchdowns to lead the position group in all major receiving categories. In his final four contests of the season, three of which were Saints victories, Johnson had 17 grabs for 206 yards and three touchdowns.

BIG TARGET

Johnson’s 12 touchdown grabs since 2022 are ranked fourth among NFL tight ends following his 16-yard scoring grab in the season opener.

This veteran tight end and New Orleans native finished his fifth NFL season and first with the Black and Gold after spending his first four campaigns with the Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders. In his career, Moreau has appeared in 80 regular season games with 48 starts and has recorded 117 receptions for 1,345 yards [11.5 avg.] with 14 TDs, also adding seven special teams tackles.

After dealing with a nagging ankle injury in his first season in New Orleans, in the Sept. 8 season-opening victory over Carolina, Moreau led the team’s tight ends in receiving with four receptions for 43 yards with one touchdown.

OFFENSIVE LINE

HOLDING THE LINE

Featuring an offensive line that only has two members [C Erik McCoy and RG Cesar Ruiz] returning to the same position they played in 2023, New Orleans Saints Offensive Line Coach John Benton, Senior Offensive Assistant Rick Dennison and Offensive Assistant Jahri Evans have managed a position group that have given up what is tied for the fewest sacks in the National Football League through the first four games of the season, while spurring the seventh-ranked run game in the NFL, that has reached the end zone nine times on the ground, the second-highest total in the league.

During this time, the Saints own a 57-23 regular season record when he corrals a signal caller and boast a 24-3 mark in a multi-sack performance. Jordan's 27 multi-sack games are tied for first in franchise record books with Rickey Jackson's 27, with both of them leading the franchise with six performances of at least three sacks.

On Dec. 24, 2022, at Cleveland, Jordan played in his 200th career game [regular season/postseason combined] in a Black and Gold uniform, moving him into third place on the club's all-time games played list. The following week at Philadelphia, Jan. 1, 2023, Jordan also started his 200th career game, joining Drew Brees as only the second player to open 200 contests in franchise history. On Sept. 24, 2023, at Green Bay, Jordan played in his 206th career game, passing Thomas Morstead for second all-time in club record books. On Oct. 29, 2023, Jordan became only the second Saints player, first defensive Saint and 57th NFL defensive lineman to play in 200 regular season contests. On Nov. 5, 2023 vs. Chicago, he became only the second Saint to start 200 career regular season contests. Jordan has played in 213 career regular season games, tied for 29th all-time among defensive linemen. On Monday night, he will play in his 214th career game and move into a tie for 27th with Vonnie Holliday and Domata Peko.

Jordan is the only NFL defender to record at least 300 tackles, 60 sacks, 75 stops for loss and 90 quarterbacks hits since 2017. Since 2017, he has posted 387 stops, 71 sacks, 89 tackles for loss and 130 quarterback hits.

Jordan is now one of only 15 National Football League players to have at least 15 sacks against two opponents, 17 against the Tampa Bay Buccaneers and 23 against the Atlanta Falcons, both NFC South divisional rivals. 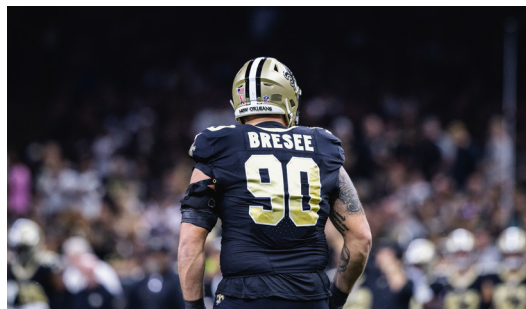

BRYAN BRESEE

The team’s first round selection in the 2023 NFL Draft out of Clemson after being a three-time All-ACC selection, the Maryland native played in 26 games with 21 starts for the Tigers, producing 54 tackles [35 solo], 15 stops for loss, nine sacks, a forced fumble, an interception and five passes defended.

Bresee immediately found a role in New Orleans’ interior rotation and appeared in all 17 games, recording 24 tackles, 4.5 sacks and six pass breakups. His takedown total was the highest by a Saints rookie defensive tackle since becoming an official statistic in 1982 and his pass defense total was the most in club records for a rookie at the position since the statistic was officially recorded in 1980, Bresee also tied for second in the league among defensive tackles in 2023.

Bresee is enjoying a breakout sophomore campaign, starting all four games and tying for second in the NFL among defensive tackles with three sacks.

CARL GRANDERSON

Signed by New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Wyoming in 2019, Granderson posted 17.5 sacks in college and possesses the prototypical frame for an NFL pass rusher. Granderson has become a significant cog in the team’s defensive line rotation with 194 tackles, 26 sacks, two pass

Earning the starting right defensive end position in 2023, Granderson posted a career-high 78 tackles [44 solo], led the team with a career-best 8.5 sacks for a 55-yard loss, one pass defense, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery. Through four-games in 2024, Granderson has 15 tackles, three sacks and one forced fumble, recording 1.5 take-downs in the last two contests.

TACKLES UP FRONT

Granderson’s 78 tackles in 2023 ranked fifth in the National Football League among defensive linemen and were the most by a Saints defensive lineman since 2004.

PAYTON TURNER

With the 28th overall pick in the 2021 NFL Draft out of Houston, the Saints added to the defensive line with this gifted pass rusher. In 18 career games, Turner has recorded 29 tackles, three sacks, one pass breakup one fumble recovery, one special teams stop and one blocked field goal. In 2023, the Texan suffered a toe injury in the season-opening win over Tennessee that would sideline him for 15 contests. However, Turner returned for the season finale vs. Atlanta and recorded the first fumble recovery of his career, showing his promise both with his pass rush and playmaking abilities. Turner is a part of the team’s defensive line rotation in 2024, recording his first sack/forced fumble of the season on Sunday at Atlanta.

CHASE YOUNG

Originally selected by Washington with the second overall pick in the 2020 NFL Draft out of Ohio State, this talented edge rusher is in his fifth season in the NFL and first with New Orleans. In five campaigns for Washington (2020-23), San Francisco (2023) and New Orleans (2024), Young has appeared in 47 regular season games with 32 starts and recorded 107 tackles (71 solo), 16.5 sacks, 20 stops for loss, nine pass breakups, six forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries. The consensus NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year, Young recorded 44 tackles, 7.5 sacks, ten stops for loss and made multiple splash plays with four forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries in 2020. Young played in only 12 games from 2021-22 after suffering a knee injury midway through his second campaign. In 2023, he played in seven games for Washington and nine for San Francisco following a midseason trade and tied his career-best with 7.5 takedowns in helping the 49ers advance to Super Bowl LVIII. Young has fit in with the New Orleans defensive line and his addition will be a boost to the front.

NATHAN SHEPHERD

Originally selected by the New York Jets in the third round of the 2018 NFL Draft out of Fort Hays State, this versatile defensive tackle enters his seventh NFL season, his second campaign with the Saints. The Ajax, Ontario, Canada native has appeared in 94 career games with 33 starts, totaling 172 tackles (90 solo) and nine sacks for a loss of 75 yards. In 2023, this valued free agent acquisition started all 17 games for New Orleans in the middle, posting career-highs in tackles (50), solo stops (26) and sacks (three).

KHALEN SAUNDERS

Originally selected by the Kansas City Chiefs in the third round of the 2019 NFL Draft out of Western Illinois, Saunders enters his sixth NFL season and second campaign with New Orleans. Signed as an unrestricted free agent in the 2023 offseason, Saunders combined with two other newcomers in Shepherd and Bresee to form a new interior front, recording career-highs in tackles (57) and solo stops (24). In 56 career regular season games with 22 starts, Saunders has recorded 139 tackles (64 solo), 4.5 sacks, three pass breakups and four stops for loss.

LINEBACKERS**DEMARIO DAVIS**

This dependable and sure-tackling defender joined the New Orleans Saints in 2018 after spending his first six NFL seasons with the New York Jets and Cleveland Browns. In his career, the Brandon, Miss. native has appeared in 197 regular season games with 183 starts for the Jets (2012-15, 2017), Browns (2016) and the Saints (2018-), recording 1,353 stops (869 solo), 43.5 sacks, three interceptions, 55 pass breakups, four forced fumbles, eight fumble recoveries and 24 special teams tackles.

In 2023, Davis started every contest and again led the Black and Gold in tackles with 121 stops (74 solo), ranked second with 6.5 sacks and added one forced fumble, one fumble recovery and four pass breakups. He joined LB Joe Federspiel as only the second Saint to have 100 stops in six straight seasons, having done so in his last seven campaigns and his tenth season overall of his 12-year National Football League career.

PETE WERNER

New Orleans selected this three-year starter from Ohio State in the second round of the 2021 NFL Draft. The Indianapolis native finished his college career playing in 47 career games with 35 starts, recording 185 tackles [111 solo], 16 stops for loss, four sacks, 11 pass breakups, four forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Werner helped power the Buckeyes to the College Football Playoff championship game as a senior in 2020, when he was voted by the Big Ten coaches as a first-team All-Conference selection and a Butkus Award semi-finalist, posting 54 tackles, 2.5 stops for loss, one sack and two forced fumbles.

In four seasons, Werner has played in 47 games with 39 starts and has recorded 252 tackles [163 solo], a split sack, one interception, four pass breakups, two forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and three special teams stops.

Werner finished the 2023 season ranked second on the team with 93 stops, a split sack, one interception, one pass breakup and two fumble recoveries, tied for the team lead. In the second week of 2024 training camp, he agreed to terms with the Saints on a three-year contract extension.

WILLIE GAY JR.

A contributor on defense for the back-to-back Super Bowl Champion Kansas City Chiefs, this sideline to sideline linebacker joined the Saints at the start of the 2024 free agency period. In five seasons, Gay has played in 61 regular season games with 51 starts, posting 237 tackles [153 solo], five sacks, four interceptions, including one returned for a touchdown, 19 pass breakups, two forced fumbles, five fumble recoveries and seven special teams stops. In nine postseason games played/starts, Gay has accumulated 29 stops, a split sack and three passes defended.

In his final season in Kansas City, Gay played in 16 regular season games with 15 starts for the Chiefs and finished the season with 58 tackles [44 solo], one sack, one interception, four pass breakups, one forced fumble and a career-high three fumble recoveries. In three postseason starts en route to the Super Bowl Championship, Gay collected nine more stops and one pass defense.

ANFERNEE ORJI

After originally signed as an undrafted free agent out of Vanderbilt in 2023, where he led the Commodores in tackles in each of his final three seasons, Orji spent his entire rookie season on the club's practice squad. He received the opportunity to see extensive snaps in practice in training camp due to injuries to teammates Davis and Werner. In three preseason contests, Orji led the team with 20 tackles [team-high 13 solo], one stop for loss, two passes defended and three special teams stops, securing a 53-man roster spot. The Saints will look to utilize Orji's speed and physicality for contributions both on defense and the team's coverage units in 2024. He leads the team with nine special teams tackles and has added one defensive stop.

SECONDARY

S TYRANN MATHIEU

This versatile, hard-hitting, playmaking safety and New Orleans native enters his third season with his hometown team, signing after the 2022 NFL Draft. Mathieu has brought experience and leadership to the Saints secondary. He was originally selected by the Arizona Cardinals in the third round (69th overall) in the 2013 NFL Draft out of LSU and has played for the Cardinals (2013-17), Houston Texans (2018), Kansas City Chiefs (2019-21) and Saints (2022-). In 11 NFL seasons, he has played in 167 regular season games with 158 starts and has posted career totals of 788 tackles (649 solo), 43 stops for loss, 11 sacks for a loss of 78 yards, 35 interceptions for 524 return yards, four brought back for touchdowns, 101 passes defended, six forced fumbles, eight fumble recoveries and five special teams stops. Mathieu has been selected to three Pro Bowls, three Associated Press All-Pro teams and the Pro Football Hall of Fame's 2010's All-Decade Team.

In his second season in New Orleans in 2023, Mathieu opened all 17 contests for the second consecutive campaign and finished with 75 tackles (50 solo), four interceptions, tied for seventh in the NFL and the team lead, returned for 122 yards with a TD and nine passes defended.

THE ONLY ONE

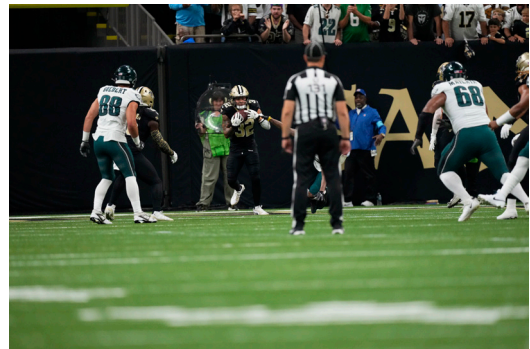

FOUR IN A ROW

Dating back to an interception in the 2023 season finale vs. Atlanta, recovering a fumble in the 2024 season opener vs. Carolina and picking off Dallas Cowboys quarterback Dak Prescott and Philadelphia Eagles signal-caller Jalen Hurts in Weeks Three and Four, Mathieu recorded a least one takeaway in four consecutive games for the first time in his career. Mathieu is the first Saints defender to record takeaways in four consecutive contests since safety Sammy Knight had at least one in five consecutive contests from Oct. 7-Nov. 4, 2001.

SAINTS AT CHIEFS

CB MARSHON LATTIMORE

Selected by the Saints in the first round (11th overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft Lattimore started all 13 games he appeared in. He totaled 53 tackles (44 solo), a forced fumble, one fumble recovery, five interceptions for 85 yards and 18 passes defended. As a rookie, Lattimore became the youngest Saint (21 years old) ever selected to the Pro Bowl and was voted as the AP NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year.

In his eighth season, Lattimore has started all 93 regular season games he has played in, recording 384 tackles (310 solo), 15 interceptions, 87 passes defended, five forced fumbles and five fumble recoveries, earning Pro Bowl honors in four seasons.

To open 2023, Lattimore came up with a standout performance in the opening win over Tennessee. In addition to his 15th career pick, to move him into a tie for eighth place in club record books in interceptions, he also finished with four passes defended, the third time in his career he has deflected at least four throws in a contest. In a season cut short by an ankle injury, he started the first ten games and posted 48 stops, one pick and eight passes defended. In 2024, he has opened three games and recorded nine tackles and one pass defense, assigned to covering the top receiver of opponents.

GET A HAND ON

Lattimore's 86 passes defended since entering the NFL in 2017 are ranked first in the league.

CB PAULSON ADEBO

New Orleans' third round selection (76th overall) in the 2021 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Adebo overcame not playing college football in 2020 to make significant contributions to the Saints secondary in his first season with the club. The Texas native finished his college career playing in 22 games with 21 starts for Stanford and recording 97 tackles, 34 pass breakups and eight interceptions, earning All-Pac 12 honors in both 2018 and 2019.

Joining the starting lineup immediately as a rookie in 2021, Adebo has played in 49 games with 48 starts, posting 231 tackles, nine interceptions, 40 pass breakups, two forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and two special teams stops.

Sharpened by an extensive training camp competition, Adebo enjoyed a breakout 2023 campaign. His season was highlighted by a two interception, three total takeaway performance in the Nov. 5, 24-17 win over Chicago that earned him NFC Defensive Player of the Week. Adebo finished with 76 tackles to lead the secondary, four interceptions, tied for first on the team with Mathieu, 18 pass breakups to rank third in the league, two forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries, also adding a pick on a two-point attempt in the Dec. 31, 23-13 win at Tampa Bay.

ALONTAE TAYLOR

Selected by the Saints in the second round [49th overall] of the 2022 NFL Draft out of Tennessee, Taylor shook off early injuries to play in 13 games with nine starts and posted 45 tackles [38 solo] and a club-best 11 pass breakups, ranked fourth among NFL rookies.

Moving to the nickel position in 2023, possessing extensive experience on the inside and the outside, Taylor appeared in all 17 games with 13 starts and recorded 75 tackles, his first two career interceptions in the last two weeks of the season and a career-high 14 pass breakups, tied for second on the team and ninth in the NFL.

In 2024, Taylor ranks second on the team with 24 tackles [18 solo], ranks first with 3.5 sacks and has added four passes defended.

DB DROP

In the Sept. 8 season-opening win over Carolina, Taylor became the first Saints defensive back to record three sacks in a contest since the statistic was officially recognized by the NFL in 1982. The only other defensive back to record three sacks on kickoff weekend is former Chargers S Rodney Harrison [vs. Buffalo, 9/6/98]. After splitting a sack on Sept. 22 vs. Philadelphia, Taylor's 3.5 sacks are the second-highest total by a cornerback in Saints record books behind Alex Molden's four in 1997.

BREAKING UP

In 2022, Taylor was the first rookie since Lattimore to lead the Saints in pass breakups [11], and only the fourth in team history to do so [Saints did not track passes defended before 1980]. He followed that up by finishing tied for second on the team with 14 in 2023.
