#### Series Notables:

- \* The Dallas Cowboys and New Orleans Saints have squared off 28 times with Dallas holding a 16-12 advantage.
- \* Dallas won 11 of the first 12 meetings against the Saints from 1967-1984.
- \* The Cowboys longest win streak in the series is six games, from 1973-84.
- \* Dallas won the first nine home games it hosted against New Orleans until the Saints first win in Dallas in 2004.

## Player Spotlight

### 19 AMARI COOPER

- ★ Amari Cooper caught eight passes for 180 yards on Thanksgiving against the Redskins, the most receiving yards by any Cowboys player in 51 Thanksgiving Day contests:

- ★ Cooper has been a force at moving the chains for the Dallas offense since he arrived, and from Weeks 9-12 he ranks fifth in the NFL with a first down conversion rate of 86.4%, picking up a first down on 19-of-22 catches as a Cowboy. He trails only Chris Godwin (15-of-16), Robert Woods (12-of-13), Tre'Quan Smith (11-of-12) and Mike Evans (14-of-16).
- ★ Cooper recorded a 90-yard touchdown reception against Washington, tied for the third-longest reception by a Cowboys player in team history. Cooper's 121 yards after the catch are the second-most in the NFL in 2018 (Albert Wilson, 139, 10/14), and are the third-most single-game yards by a Cowboys receiver since 1992 (Miles Austin, 152, 10/11/09; Marion Barber, 128, 10/12/08).

## BY THE NUMBERS

Ezekiel Elliott has 18 games with at least 100 rushing yards since the Cowboys drafted him in the first round of the 2016 NFL Draft, the most in the NFL over that span. No other player has more than 12 games in the same time period. Elliott leads the NFL in rushing yards (1,074), is third in yards after contact (388), and ranks second in the league with a 15-plus yard rush on 41.3%\* of his carries (Saquan Barkley, 49.9%) in 2018.

The Cowboys defense has prevented the big play in 2018, allowing only 34 plays of 20-plus yards on the season, fourth-fewest in 2018. Dallas also ranks near the top of the league in forcing negative plays on defense, placing ninth with 74 forced negative plays (28 sacks, six negative passes and 40 negative rushes).

Byron Jones has shut down opposing receivers in 2018, allowing a passer rating of only 67.4 on throws against him, and is one-of-two players in 2018 to limit opposing receivers to a catch percentage of 50%-or-less (50.0%) and not allow a single touchdown in coverage (Brandon Carr, 49.1%).

## 2018 UPCOMING MILESTONES AND CURRENT NOTES

With the second half of the 2018 season underway for the Dallas Cowboys, the following information pertains to the most current notes, rankings and upcoming milestones:

### 2018 DALLAS COWBOYS CURRENT TEAM/PLAYER RANKINGS:

- \* The Cowboys rushing attack ranks fifth in the league with an average of 134.5 yards-per-game, led by Ezekiel Elliott, whose 1,074 rushing yards are tops in the league (**RUSHING TO THE TOP - page 15**).
- \* Additionally, Dallas' 4.87 yards-per-carry is fifth in the NFL and 84 rushing first downs are sixth (**RUSHING TO THE TOP - page 15**).
- \* The Cowboys have 45 "Big-Play" runs of 10-plus yards to place fifth in the NFL (**BIG PLAY RUNS - page 15**).
- \* Dak Prescott leads the NFL in rushing touchdowns (five) and is fifth among NFL quarterbacks with 279 rushing yards (**RAYNE MAN - page 12**).
- \* Ezekiel Elliott has posted six 100-yard rushing games to tie the most in the NFL in 2018, and he has the most (18) from 2016-18 (**KEEP IT 100 - page 13**).
- \* Elliott is tied for the league lead in the NFL with 31 "Big-Play" runs of 10-plus yards, and he also boasts the most (100) from 2016-18 (**BIG PLAY ZEKE - page 14**).
- \* Elliott ranks second in the NFL with 1,437 total scrimmage yards (1,074 rush; 363 receiving) (**ZEKE & DESTROY - page 14**).
- \* Elliott makes up 37% (1,437 total scrimmage yards) of the Cowboys offensive output (**DIVIDING UP THE OFFENSIVE PIE - page 14**).
- \* Elliott is tied for third in the NFL in total first downs with 66 (ranks second in rushing first downs with 54) (**'EZE' DOES IT - page 15**).
- \* In four games since acquiring Amari Cooper, he has posted the third-most receiving first downs (19), sixth-most receiving yards (349), tied for the sixth-most receiving touchdowns (three) and tied for the seventh-best receiving average (15.9) from Week 9-12 among all NFL receivers (**THE AMARI EFFECT - page 15**).
- \* The Dallas offense has improved in multiple offensive categories since acquiring Cooper (**CONTINUING THE AMARI EFFECT - page 15**).
- \* The Cowboys are holding opponents to 19.4 points-per-game (213 total points), fourth-fewest in the NFL (**POINTS HARD TO COME BY - page 16**).
- \* The Dallas defense ranks eighth overall in total defense, limiting opponents to 331.1 yards-per-game (**TOP TEN D - page 16**).
- \* The Cowboys defense is fifth in the redzone, allowing only 15 touchdowns in 31 offensive appearances (48.4) (**RED DEFENSE RE-DEMPTION - page 16**).
- \* DeMarcus "Tank" Lawrence leads the defense and ranks 13th in the NFL with 8.5 sacks (**TANK ON A ROLL - page 16**).
- \* Leighton Vander Esch leads the Cowboys defense with 119 tackles - third-most stops by a rookie in team history, since tackles started to be tracked by coaches film in 1981 (**TACKLE LIKE A ROOKIE - page 16**).
- \* Brett Maher is tied for the third-most made field goals (22) in the NFL (**BRETT 'MONEY' MAHER - page 17**).
- \* Maher is also tied for the second-most field goals made from 50-plus yards and the fourth-most in single season team history (**NO PROBLEM FROM FIFTY - page 17**).

### 2018 DALLAS COWBOYS UPCOMING MILESTONES - INDIVIDUAL:

#### Amari Cooper - WR

- \* Amari Cooper (currently at 247) needs three receptions to reach 250 for his career.

#### Ezekiel Elliott - RB

- \* With at least 100 rushing yards against New Orleans, it will mark Ezekiel Elliott's fourth straight game over the century mark and tie the longest streak of his career (9/25/16-10/16/16).
- \* Elliott (currently at 18) needs one 100-yard rushing game to tie DeMarco Murray (19) for the fourth-most 100-yard rushing games by a Cowboys rusher in team history (**THE BOOK OF EZEKIEL - page 13**).
- \* With a 100-yard game, Elliott would tie his career-high for a season with seven (2016).
- \* Elliott (currently at 28) needs two rushing touchdowns to become the eighth player in team history to reach 30 in a career.
- \* With at least 200 scrimmage yards, it would mark Elliott's fifth career game with 200 scrimmage yards to serve as the most by a Dallas Cowboy. It would also be Elliott's third such game of the season to establish a franchise record for the most games with at least 200 scrimmage yards in a season (**ZEKE & DESTROY - page 14**).
- \* Elliott (currently at 995) needs five receiving yards to reach 1,000 for his career and become the 16th running back in team history to accomplish that feat.
- \* Elliott (currently at 363) needs one receiving yard to top his 2016 total (363) and establish a single-season career-best.
- \* Elliott (currently at 47) needs three receptions to become the ninth running back in team history to reach 50 receptions in a season.
- \* Elliott (currently at two) needs one receiving touchdown to establish a single-season career-high.

#### L.P. Ladouceur - LS

- \* By playing against New Orleans (11/29), L.P. Ladouceur (currently fourth at 216) will tie Bill Bates (217) for the third-most games played in franchise history.

#### DeMarcus Lawrence - DE

- \* DeMarcus Lawrence (currently at 8.5) needs 1.5 sacks to reach 10.0 sacks on the season to mark the first time a Dallas defender has posted double-digit sacks in consecutive seasons since DeMarcus Ware had a streak of five seasons from 2007-11.
- \* Lawrence (currently at 32.0) needs 2.0 sacks to top Anthony Spencer (33.0) for eighth on the team's all-time sacks list. With 3.0 sacks he ties Charles Haley (34.0) for seventh.

#### Brett Maher - K

- \* Brett Maher (currently at four) needs to make one 50-yard field goal to tie Dan Bailey's 2014 & 2015 totals for the second-most made in single season team history. With two he ties Bailey's 2013 total for the most made in a single season team history (**NO PROBLEM FROM FIFTY - page 17**).

#### Dak Prescott - QB

- \* Dak Prescott (currently at 1,285) needs 24 pass attempts to top Craig Morton (1,308) for sixth all-time in franchise history (**DAK TO THE FUTURE - page 10**).
- \* Prescott (currently at 58) needs 11 rushing attempts to top Quincy Carter (68 – 2003) for the most by a Cowboys quarterback in a single season.
- \* With a rushing touchdown against New Orleans, it will mark Prescott's fourth straight game to increase his career-long streak.
- \* Prescott (currently at five) needs one rushing touchdown to tie his 2016 and 2017 totals for the most rushing scores by a Cowboys quarterback in a single season in team history.

#### Jaylon Smith - LB

- \* Jaylon Smith (currently at 95) needs five tackles to establish a single-season career-high and cross the century mark in tackles for the first time in his career.
- \* Smith (currently at 194) needs six tackles to reach 200 for his career.

#### Leighton Vander Esch - LB

- \* Leighton Vander Esch (currently at 119) needs 18 stops to move past Dexter Coakley (136 – 1997) and take over as the all-time leader in tackles by a rookie (**TACKLE LIKE A ROOKIE - page 16**).



## 2018 POSTGAME NOTES - VS WASHINGTON (11/22)

### 2018 DALLAS COWBOYS POSTGAME NOTES VS WASHINGTON (11/22) - TEAM:

- \* The Dallas Cowboys hosted their 51st game on Thanksgiving Day, and with the victory, Dallas improved its all-time Thanksgiving Day record to 31-19-1.
- \* The victory was also the eighth against the Redskins, first since 2016 - most against any opponent on Turkey Day - as Dallas upped its record against Washington to 8-1 during the teams' holiday-high ninth matchup.
- \* Dallas improved its 2018 record in the NFC East to 3-1, and 5-3 overall in the NFC.
- \* It was the Cowboys third win in a row, longest of the season, and the longest since a three-game streak last season (11/30-12/17).
- \* The Cowboys defense had three interceptions in the game - the first time that has happened since the unit had three picks against Tampa Bay (12/18/16).
- \* Dallas has not allowed a single opposing rusher over 100 yards in eight straight games, and 10-of-11 games played this season. They have also held opposing teams to under 100 net yards rushing in three straight games.
- \* DeMarcus Lawrence and Anthony Brown are the first Cowboys to record a sack statistic and an interception since Ronaldo McClain did it against Tennessee (9/14/14).
- \* Dallas' offense notched 404 total net yards - third-highest output this season and the third time the offense has reached 400 yards in a game.

### 2018 DALLAS COWBOYS POSTGAME NOTES VS WASHINGTON (11/22) - INDIVIDUAL:

#### Cole Beasley - WR

- \* Cole Beasley reached 300 career receptions.

#### Amari Cooper - WR

- \* Amari Cooper led the team with eight receptions for 180 yards and two touchdowns.
- \* Cooper's 180 receiving yards were the most by a Cowboys receiver on Thanksgiving Day, and the most receiving yards by a Cowboys receiver since Dez Bryant had 224 against New Orleans (12/23/12).
- \* It is also the first time Dallas has had a 100-yard receiver since Cole Beasley posted 101 yards against Jacksonville (10/14/18).
- \* Cooper's 180 yards were the second-most of his career, and are tied for the fourth-most by any NFL receiver in a game this season (**FLYING THE COOP - page 15**).
- \* Cooper's eight receptions tied for the fifth-most of his career.
- \* His 90-yard touchdown reception set a career-long, and is the longest reception by any NFL receiver in 2018. It was also the longest since Jason Tucker had a 90-yard touchdown catch against the N.Y. Giants (1/2/00).

#### Ezekiel Elliott - RB

- \* Ezekiel Elliott rushed 26 times for 121 yards and a touchdown and caught five passes for 22 yards, for a total of 143 scrimmage yards.
- \* Elliott's 121 rushing yards allowed him to reach 1,000 on the season - his second career 1,000-yard rushing season. With two 1,000-yard rushing seasons, Elliott tied Calvin Hill (1972-73) and DeMarco Murray (2013-14) for the third-most in team history (**GOOD FOR ANOTHER 1K - page 13**).
- \* It was Elliott's 18th career 100-yard rushing game in the regular season, good for fourth all-time, and Dallas moved to 15-3 when he tops 100 yards on the ground, 5-1 in 2018 (**THE BOOK OF EZEKIEL - page 13**).
- \* It was will Elliott's third straight game over the century mark and tied the second-longest streak of his career (10/8/17-10/29/17).
- \* Elliott became the first NFL runner this season to top 100 rushing yards against Washington.
- \* By totaling 26 carries, Elliott posted his 26th career game with at least 20 carries and the Cowboys improved to 20-6 in those games (**THE BOOK OF EZEKIEL - page 13**).
- \* Elliott had one rushing touchdown to break a tie with Herschel Walker (27) and tie Ron Springs and DeMarco Murray (28) for eighth on the club's all-time list.
- \* Elliott's 28 rushing touchdowns are the second-most to Todd Gurley (32) by any NFL rusher since entering the league in 2016.
- \* Elliott's 22 receiving yards gave him 363 on the season to tie his 2016 total.
- \* It was Elliott's fourth straight game with 100 yards from scrimmage, tied for the fourth-longest streak of his career.

#### Zack Martin - G

- \* Zack Martin played and started in his 75th career - and consecutive - game.

#### Dak Prescott - QB

- \* Dak Prescott completed 22 passes on 31 attempts for a season-high 289 yards with two touchdowns, no interceptions and a 121.6 rating - highest of the season. He also rushed six times for 18 yards and a touchdown.
- \* Prescott's 90-yard touchdown pass to Amari Cooper in the third quarter was the longest pass of his career, the second-longest pass play by any duo in the NFL this season and tied for the third-longest pass in Cowboys history (**THROWING BOMBS - page 12**).
- \* Prescott is the first Cowboys quarterback with two 40-yard touchdown passes in a single quarter since Tony Romo had two at Detroit (10/27/13).
- \* With two passing touchdowns and a rushing touchdown, Prescott posted his seventh such game in his career to break a tie with Roger Staubach for the most in team history (**TDS BY LAND AND AIR - page 12**).
- \* It was also Prescott's 12th career game with at least one passing touchdown and a rushing touchdown to break a tie with Steve Grogan for sole possession of the second-most by a player in his first three seasons in NFL history (**TDS BY LAND AND AIR - page 12**).
- \* It was Prescott's third straight game with a rushing touchdown, the first time he has accomplished this in his career.
- \* Prescott had six rushing attempts to give him 58 on the season to top both his 2016 and 2017 totals (both at 57) and establish a single-season career-best.

#### Leighton Vander Esch - LB

- \* Leighton Vander Esch's 11 tackles gave him 119 on the season (according to coaches film) and allowed him to top Robert Jones (108 - 1992) and Michael Downs (110 - 1981) for the third-highest tackle total by a rookie in team history, since 1981 when the start started to be tracked by coaches film (**TACKLE LIKE A ROOKIE - page 16**).

## ★ HEAD COACHES ★

### JASON GARRETT (73-58, 8th Year)

Jason Garrett was named the eighth head coach in Dallas Cowboys history on January 5, 2011. Garrett became the first former Dallas Cowboys player to become the team's head coach. As a backup quarterback during his playing career in Dallas, he started nine-of-23 games played and was a member of teams that won six division titles and three Super Bowl championships.

Garrett was elevated to the Cowboys top job after taking over as the team's interim head coach midway through 2010. He guided the club to a 5-3 mark to finish the season after the team started 1-7. He led Dallas to an 8-8 record, narrowly missing the playoffs and an NFC East Division title in each his first three full seasons as head coach (2011-13). Garrett guided the 2014 squad to an NFL-best tying 12-4 record, the club's 22nd Division title - 18th NFC East title - 31st postseason appearance and 34th playoff win. His team fought through adversity in 2015, especially on the injury front where they endured injuries to Tony Romo, Dez Bryant and Orlando Scandrick amongst others, while slipping to 4-12 on the season. The team bounced back under Garrett in 2016, completing the club's largest one-season turnaround in franchise history with a nine-game difference, finishing with a 13-3 record in 2016. The record included beginning the season 0-1 and going on to win 11 straight games - the longest single-season win streak in team history. Garrett's Cowboys won their second division championship with him at the helm, while earning the NFC's top overall seed and hosting an NFC Divisional Playoff Game for the first time since 2007. He was named AP Coach of the Year for his team's 2016 accomplishments. The 2017 Cowboys finished 9-7, just missing the playoffs, but their record gave them back-to-back winning seasons for the first time since 2008-09.

From 2007-13, when Garrett was brought on board as the Cowboys offensive coordinator, the unit finished among the NFL's top-10 in total offense in five of his seven years at the helm: 2013 (10th), 2012 (6th), 2010 (10th), 2009 (2nd) and 2007 (2nd). The team has set single-season records in a handful of categories, including topping 6,000 net yards for the first four times in franchise history (2009- 6,390; 2011 - 6,008; 2014 - 6,138 and 2016 - 6,027). Since his arrival in 2007, not only has the team set single-season records in numerous offensive categories, but the club's cumulative numbers for gross passing yards (39,993) and total points (3,919) represent the best totals over a 10-year span in the history of the organization while the club's 58,567 total net yards are second.

### SEAN PAYTON (122-77, 12th Year)

Since he was hired as head coach of the New Orleans Saints in 2006, Sean Payton has established himself as one of the most successful coaches in the NFL. Payton has led the Saints to six playoff berths, four NFC South division titles, and in 2009, captured the franchise's first World Championship with a 31-17 win over the Indianapolis Colts in Super Bowl XLIV.

Payton has a 122-77 overall record (.613), including a 7-5 postseason mark (.583) after the franchise had won only one playoff game prior to his arrival. Payton holds the club's top win total and winning percentage for a head coach.

The 2017 Saints produced an 11-5 regular season record producing their first playoff berth since 2013. In running back Alvin Kamara and cornerback Marshon Lattimore, the 2017 Saints were the first team to have both the *Associated Press* NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year and Defensive Rookie of the Year since 1967.

In 2009 en route to the Super Bowl XLIV title, Payton guided the Saints to the team's second NFC South title in four seasons with a 13-3 record. Along the way, the Saints set a franchise-record for most regular season wins in (13). Their 16 overall victories were the most in the club's history. The Saints also posted the franchise's longest winning streak and best start when they won their first 13 contests. Payton once again was named as the top head coach in the NFL by numerous media outlets and recognized football chapters.

Payton scrapped the traditional timetable for rebuilding a club in 2006. In his opening season as a head coach, the Saints jumped out to a 3-0 record - a first in team history, equaling the team's win total from the previous year - and clinched the NFC South title before the regular season finale.

Payton was hired as the 14th head coach in Saints history on Jan. 18, 2006 after serving as a member of the Dallas Cowboys coaching staff from 2003-05 under 2013 Pro Football Hall of Fame inductee Bill Parcells. Payton went to Dallas following four years with the New York Giants (1999-2002), the last three as offensive coordinator after spending his first season as quarterbacks coach.

Since his first year as a play-caller in 2000, every passer under Payton's guidance has thrown for over 3,000 yards.

## SOLD OUT STADIUMS

The Cowboys have played in front of sold out stadiums in 463 of their last 465 games (including playoffs) and in 265 consecutive games. They played in front of sold out crowds in 153 consecutive games at Texas Stadium (including playoffs) - dating back to Dec. 16, 1990 against Phoenix, their last home non-sellout. Dallas opened what is now named AT&T Stadium with the largest crowd to witness a regular season NFL game with 105,121 tickets distributed and have 79 straight sellouts (including playoffs). The Cowboys have sold out each of their last 230 home games.

On the road, Dallas has played in front of sold out crowds in 132 straight games (including playoffs), dating back to its last road non-sellout - at Arizona (10/20/02).

## AT&T STADIUM RECORD WHEN...

In 2018 the Dallas Cowboys reached a milestone with their 10th season in what is now AT&T Stadium. This season the Cowboys have a 4-1 record at home.

## THE BOOK OF EZEKIEL

For only the second time in franchise history, the Dallas Cowboys used a top-five pick on a running back when they chose Ezekiel Elliott out of Ohio State with the fourth overall selection in the 2016 NFL Draft. Dallas selected Tony Dorsett with the second pick in the 1977 NFL Draft.

After earning the NFL's rushing title as a rookie in 2016 with 1,631 yards, Elliott finished 10th in 2017 with 983 yards on 242 carries and seven touchdowns.

In his first season, Elliott produced seven 100-yard rushing games - most by a Cowboys rookie, tied for seventh by a league rookie all-time and tied for the most in the NFL in 2016. He added five more 100-yard outings in 2017, and with six in 2018, he owns 18 for his career to rank fourth all-time in team history.

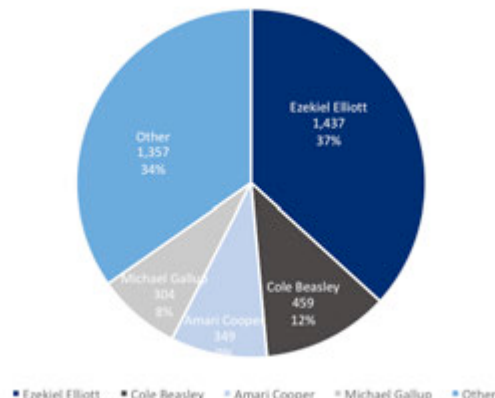

After trading for Amari Cooper with the Oakland Raiders on Oct. 22 for a first round draft choice in 2019, the Dallas Cowboys have seen immediate results in their offense. In four games since acquiring Cooper, the former fourth overall pick in the 2015 NFL Draft, has posted 22 receptions for 349 yards (15.9), 19 first downs and three touchdowns - most on the team, and good for the third-most receiving first downs, sixth-most receiving yards, tied for the sixth-most receiving touchdowns, tied for the seventh-best receiving yards average and tied for the 12th-most receptions from Week 9-12 in the NFL:
