ALL-TIME SERIES

New Orleans leads the all-time series, 33-21, and the Saints lead the series, 20-14, as NFC South rivals, with the two teams splitting the series in each of the past four seasons (2015-18). The Saints swept the Buccaneers from 2012-14, but the Buccaneers swept both contests in 2005 and 2007 before splitting each series from 2008-11, including a 10-3 victory in 2005 in a road contest played in Baton Rouge and a 27-13 win in the 2005 regular season home finale, a victory that clinched the NFC South title for the Buccaneers.

Prior to joining the NFC South, Tampa Bay had claimed three of the previous four meetings, including wins in both 1999 and 2001. The Bucs won the first game between the two clubs, a 33-14 triumph at the Superdome in 1977. Tampa Bay tied an NFL record, which has since been broken, by returning three interceptions for touchdowns. The victory marked the Bucs' first regular season win after 26 consecutive losses. More than 8,000 fans greeted the team upon its return to One Buccaneer Place. Tampa Bay and New Orleans split the next four meetings, each winning two straight on the other team's turf before the Saints assembled a six-game winning streak.

'SACK' BARRETT



- Barrett ranks first in the NFL with 9.0 sacks through Week 4 of the 2019 NFL season. He is one of four players in NFL history with 9.0 sacks through his team's first four games.

- Barrett has also generated four takeaways through the first four weeks of the

season, including being tied for third with three forced fumbles on the season.

- A season ago, the Buccaneers ranked 20th in defensive rush average and 24th in rushing yards allowed per game. Through Week 4, Tampa Bay ranks as the best team in the NFL in both categories, while facing Christian McCaffrey, Saquon Barkley, Todd Gurley and the 49ers second-ranked rushing attack.



QB JAMEIS WINSTON



- The Buccaneers offense has taken off in the last two weeks, averaging 481.5 total yards per game to lead the league during that span.

- In that two-game stretch from Week 3 to Week 4, Winston became just the second

Buccaneers passer to throw for 375-plus yards in consecutive games (Ryan Fitzpatrick, 9/9/18 at New Orleans-9/24/18 vs. Pittsburgh). Winston has thrown for the third-most passing yards through the team's first four games in Buccaneers history.

BEST IN THE BUSINESS



• Through the first four weeks of the season, wide receivers Chris Godwin and Mike Evans have each put forth a top 10 single-game receiving performance in Buccaneers history.

In Week 3, Mike Evans racked up 190 yards receiving, which are the fifth-most for a single game in team history. Chris Godwin followed that up with 172 yards in Week 4, which rank ninth for a single game in team history.

• In addition, Godwin currently ranks third in the NFL in receiving with 386 yards, while Evans ranks sixth with 368. Together, they are the most potent receiving duo in the NFL with a combined 754 yards receiving through four games.

TEAM TAKEAWAY

• Through the first four weeks of the season, the Buccaneers defense ranks second in the NFL with nine takeaways, trailing only the New England Patriots (10).

• Tampa Bay is also just one of four teams to have scored multiple defensive touchdowns this season.

Vernon Hargreaves III returned an interception 15 yards for a touchdown in the season opener versus San Francisco, while DL **Ndamukong Suh** took a fumble 37 yards to the house after it was forced out by OLB **Shaquil Barrett** in Week 4 at Los Angeles, sealing the win for the Bucs.

• The Buccaneers were tied for 22nd in the league in takeaways last season, finishing with 17. In addition, the two defensive touchdowns through four games in 2019 is already double the amount that the 2018 team recorded in 16 games last year.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

Buccaneers Team

- The Buccaneers scored a franchise-record 55 points at the Rams. If the Buccaneers score 50 or more at the Saints, it will mark only the seventh time in NFL history that a team has posted consecutive games with at least 50 points (most recently: Green Bay Packers, 11/9/14-11/16/14).
- The Buccaneers have scored at least 30 points in each of the past two games. If the Buccaneers score 30 or more points at the Saints, it will tie the franchise record for the longest streak of games scoring at least 30 points (also 10/25/12 at Minnesota-11/11/12 vs. San Diego; 9/21/03 at Atlanta-10/12/03 at Washington).
- The Buccaneers have recorded at least 450 net yards in each of the past two games. If the team reaches at least 450 yards at the Saints, it will mark only the second time in team history that Tampa Bay has posted three consecutive games with at least 450 total yards (also 10/14/18 at Atlanta-10/28/18 at Cincinnati).
- The Buccaneers have recorded at least 350 passing yards in each of the past two games. If the team reaches at least 350 passing yards at the Saints, it will mark only the second time in team history that Tampa Bay has posted three consecutive games with at least 350 net passing yards (previously: 9/9/18 at New Orleans-9/24/18 vs. Pittsburgh).
- The Buccaneers have scored 123 points through the first four games, the most through four games in team history. The team needs three points to tie for the fourth-most (126 in 2002), four points to tie for second-most (127 in 2000 and 2003) and 18 points to tie for the most points through five games in team history.
- The Buccaneers returned a fumble for a touchdown at the Rams. If the team returns a fumble for a touchdown at New Orleans, it will mark only the third-time in franchise history that Tampa Bay has had a fumble return touchdown in consecutive games (last: 12/31/17 vs. Atlanta-9/9/18 at New Orleans).
- The Buccaneers recorded three interceptions at the Rams. If the team intercepts three or more passes at New Orleans, it will mark the first time Tampa Bay has posted consecutive games with at least three interceptions since 2002 (11/17/02 vs. Carolina-11/24/02 at Green Bay).
- The Buccaneers have held each of their first four opponents under 100 rushing yards. If the team holds New Orleans under 100 rushing yards, it will mark the longest streak holding Tampa Bay opponents to less than 100 rushing yards since the team did so in six consecutive games in 2005 (9/11/05 at Minnesota-10/16/05 vs. Miami) and will tie for the fifth-longest such streak in team history.
- The Buccaneers have allowed only 237 rushing yards this season. If the team holds New Orleans to 70 or fewer rushing yards, it will mark the fewest rushing yards allowed through five games in team history (301 in 2005).

QB Jameis Winston

- Winston threw four touchdown passes at the Rams. With four or more touchdown passes at New Orleans, he would join Ryan Fitzpatrick (9/9/18 at New Orleans-9/16/18 vs. Philadelphia) as the only players in team history to throw for at least four touchdowns in consecutive games.
- Winston has thrown for at least three touchdowns in each of the past two games. With three or more touchdown passes at the Saints, it would tie the Buccaneers record for consecutive games with at least three touchdown passes (Ryan Fitzpatrick in 2018, Josh Freeman in 2012 and Vinny Testaverde in 1989).

QB Jameis Winston

- Winston has thrown for 375 yards in each of the past two games. With at least 375 passing yards at the Saints, it would mark only the second time in team history that a player has posted three consecutive games with 375 or more passing yards (also Ryan Fitzpatrick, 9/9/18 at New Orleans-9/24/18 vs. Pittsburgh).
- If Winston throws for at least 375 yards and three touchdowns at the Saints, he will join Fitzpatrick and Tom Brady (9/12/11 at Miami-9/25/11 at Buffalo) as the only players in NFL history to throw for at least 375 yards and three touchdowns in three consecutive games.
- Winston has recorded a passer rating over 100 in each of the past three games, matching a career high. If he posts a passer rating of 100 or more at the Saints, it will mark only the third time in team history that a Buccaneers quarterback has recorded a passer rating of 100 or more in at least four consecutive games (also: Josh Freeman, franchise-record five consecutive games, 10/14/12 vs. Kansas City-11/11/12 vs. San Diego; Vinny Testaverde, four consecutive games, 9/23/90 vs. Detroit-10/14/90 vs. Green Bay).
- Winston has thrown for 1,167 yards through four games. He needs 60 yards to pass Brad Johnson (1,226 in 2002) for fifth-most, 93 yards to pass Winston's own mark (1,259 in 2017) for fourth-most, 161 to pass Winston's own mark (1,327 in 2016) for third-most, 189 to pass Brad Johnson (1,355 in 2003) for second-most and 190 to pass Ryan Fitzpatrick (1,356 in 2018) for the most passing yards by a Buccaneers quarterback through five game in team history.
- Winston has thrown for nine touchdowns through four games. He needs one touchdown pass to tie Trent Dilfer (10 in 1007) for third-most, two to tie Ryan Fitzpatrick for second-most (11 in 2018) and three to tie Brad Johnson (12 in 2003) for the most passing touchdowns by a Buccaneers quarterback through five game in team history.
- Winston has 15,795 career passing yards. This season he needs 2,214 more to pass Andy Dalton (18,008 from 2011-15) for 10th-most, 2,399 more to pass Russell Wilson (18,193 from 2012-16) for ninth-most, 2,469 more to pass Cam Newton (18,263 from 2011-15) for eighth-most, 2,554 more to pass Drew Bledsoe (18,348 from 1993-97) for seventh-most, 2,661 more to pass Ryan Tannehill (18,455 from 2012-16) for sixth-most, 2,915 more to pass Derek Carr (18,739 from 2014-18) for fifth-most, 3,163 more to pass Matt Ryan (18,957 from 2008-12) for fourth-most, 3,284 more to pass Andrew Luck (19,078 from 2012-16) for third-most, 4,618 more to pass Dan Marino (19,422 from 1983-87) for second-most and 4,824 more to pass Peyton Manning (20,618 from 1998-2002) for the most passing yards by a player from their rookie season through their fifth season.
- Winston has 97 career passing touchdowns. This season he needs 11 more to tie Drew Bledsoe (108 from 1993-97) for 10th-most, 12 more to tie Matthew Stafford (109 from 2009-13) for ninth-most, 20 more to tie Cam Newton (117 from 2011-15) for eighth-most, 25 more to tie Derek Carr (122 from 2014-18) for seventh-most, 27 more to tie Andy Dalton (124 from 2011-15) for sixth-most, 30 more to tie Matt Ryan (127 from 2008-12) and Russell Wilson (127 from 2012-16) for fourth-most, 35 more to tie Andrew Luck (132 from 2012-16) and 41 more to tie Peyton Manning (138 from 1998-2002) for the second-most passing touchdowns by a player from their rookie season through their fifth season.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

RB Peyton Barber

- Barber has 11 career rushing touchdowns. He needs four more to tie Earnest Graham (15 from 2004-11) and Lars Tate (15 from 1988-89) for the ninth-most rushing touchdowns in team history.
- Barber has 1,699 career rushing yards. He needs 349 more to pass Earnest Graham (2,047 from 2004-11) for the 10th-most rushing yards in team history.

OLB Shaquil Barrett

- Barrett has 9.0 sacks this season, tied for the most by any NFL player through four games since sacks became an official statistic in 1982. He needs one sack to tie Kevin Greene (10.0 in 1998, Carolina) for the most sacks through five games in NFL history. With a half-sack, he would tie Robert Mathis (9.5 in 2013, Indianapolis) for the second-most sacks through four games in NFL history.
- Barrett has 9.0 sacks on the season and needs 2.0 more to tie Simeon Rice (11.0 in 2001), Lee Roy Selmon (11.0 in 1978, 1979 and 1983) and Broderick Thomas (11.0 in 1991) for the 10th-most sacks in a single season in team history.
- Barrett has recorded a sack in each of the first four games of the season. With a sack at the Saints, he will join Brad Culpepper (franchise-record eight consecutive games in 1998), Jason Pierre-Paul (six consecutive games in 2018) and Simeon Rice (six consecutive games in 2002 and five consecutive games in 2001) as the only players in franchise history to record a sack in at least five consecutive games.

TE Cameron Brate

- Brate has 24 career touchdown catches. He needs one more to pass Dave Moore (24 from 1992-2001) for seventh-most tie Mike Williams (25 from 2010-13) for the sixth-most touchdown receptions in team history.
- Brate has 168 career receptions. He needs 17 more to pass Dave Moore (184 from 1992-2001, 2004-06) for the fourth-most receptions by a tight end in team history.
- Brate has three career games with multiple touchdown receptions. He needs one more to tie Jimmie Giles for the most ever such games by a Buccaneers tight end and tie for the third-most such games in franchise history.

LB Lavonte David

- David has 21.5 career sacks. He needs 4.5 more to tie Greg Spires (26.0 from 2002-07) for 10th-most and 5.0 more to pass Broderick Thomas (26.5 from 1989-93) for the ninth-most sacks in franchise history. Thomas holds the record for the most sacks by a linebacker in franchise history.
- David has 11 career interceptions and needs 14 more to tie Derrick Brooks (25 from 1995-2008) for the most interceptions by a linebacker in franchise history.
- David has three career defensive touchdowns and needs one more to tie for the third-most in franchise history (David Logan, 1979-96; Mike Washington, 1976-84).

WR Mike Evans

- Evans has surpassed 1,000 receiving yards in each of his first five seasons and, with 1,000 or more receiving yards this season, will join Randy Moss (1998-2003) as the only players in NFL history to record 1,000 or more receiving yards in each of their first six seasons. Evans would extend his team record for 1,000-yard receiving seasons and consecutive 1,000-yard receiving seasons.
- Evans has recorded 413 career receptions and needs 18 more to pass James Wilder (430 from 1981-89) for the most receptions in franchise history.
- Evans has 6,471 career receiving yards. This year he needs 547 more to pass Larry Fitzgerald (7,067 from 2004-09) for 10th-most, 618 more to pass Marvin Harrison (7,078 from 1996-2001) for ninth-most, 633 more to pass Antonio Brown (7,093 from 2010-15) for eighth-most, 855 more to pass A.J. Green (7,135 from 2011-16) for seventh-most, 977 more to pass DeAndre Hopkins (7,437 from 2013-18) for sixth-most, 1,150 more to pass Julio Jones (7,610 from 2011-16) for fifth-most, 1,376 more to pass Calvin Johnson (7,836 from 2007-12) for fourth-most and 1,006 more to pass Jerry Rice (7,866 from 1985-90) for the third-most receiving yards in a players' first six seasons since the 1970 NFL/AFL merger.
- Evans has 45 touchdowns from scrimmage as a Buccaneer and needs one more to tie James Wilder (46 from 1981-89) for the second-most touchdowns in franchise history.

WR Chris Godwin

- Godwin caught 12 passes at the Rams. With 10 or more reception at the Saints, he will join James Wilder (11/25/84 vs. Rams-12/2/84 vs. Packers) as the only players in team history to record consecutive games with at least 10 receptions.
- Godwin caught two touchdown passes at the Rams. With at least two touchdown receptions at the Saints, he will join Vincent Jackson (10/13/13 vs. Philadelphia-10/20/13 at Atlanta) and Horace Copeland (10/24/93 vs. Green Bay-10/31/93 at Atlanta) as the only players in franchise history to record consecutive games with multiple touchdown receptions.
- Godwin had 172 receiving yards at the Rams. With at least 150 receiving yards at the Saints, he would be the first player in franchise history to post consecutive games with 150 or more receiving yards.
- If Godwin records at least 170 receiving yards at the Saints he will be the first NFL player to do so in consecutive games since 2014 (Atlanta WR Julio Jones, 11/30/14 vs. Arizona-12/8/14 at Green Bay).
- If Godwin records at least 150 receiving yards and two or more receiving touchdowns at the Saints he will be the first NFL player to do so in consecutive games since 2014 (Philadelphia WR Jeremy Maclin, 10/26/14 at Arizona-11/2/14 at Houston).
- With at least 10 receptions, 150 receiving yards and two or more receiving touchdowns at the Saints, Godwin would join former Titans WR Drew Bennett (12/13/04 vs. Kansas City-12/19/04 at Oakland) as the only players in NFL history to do so in consecutive games.

BRUCE ARIANS



Bruce Arians was named the 12th head coach in franchise history on January 8, 2019.

Arians is a two-time Associated Press NFL Coach of the Year, earning the award in 2012 (Indianapolis Colts) and in 2014 (Arizona Cardinals). He is the only coach in NFL history to earn the award multiple times in a three-year span with different teams and is one of only 12 coaches in NFL history to win the award multiple times.

Prior to arriving in Tampa, Arians spent five seasons as the head coach of the Arizona Cardinals (2013-17) in addition to a 12-game stint as interim head coach for the Indianapolis Colts (2012), compiling a regular season record of 58-33-1. During that 92-game stretch Arians was a head coach, his 58 wins ranked fourth in the NFL, trailing only Bill Belichick (73), Pete Carroll (63) and Mike Tomlin (59).

Throughout his 25-year NFL career, Arians has worked closely with some of the league's top passers including Pro Bowlers Peyton Manning, Ben Roethlisberger, Andrew Luck and Carson Palmer. As an offensive play-caller, Arians has directed top-10 offenses with three different teams (Arizona, Indianapolis and Pittsburgh) over the last nine seasons of his coaching career.

During his time in Arizona, the York, Pennsylvania native compiled a 49-30-1 regular season record (.619 winning percentage). The Cardinals' 49 wins during that span were the seventh-most in the NFL and the third-most in the NFC. Arians won 50 total games in Arizona (49 regular season, one postseason), finishing his time there as the winningest coach in franchise history. His 49 regular season wins are also the most by any coach in Cardinals history.

Arians posted three seasons with double-digit wins as the head coach of the Cardinals, including tying the then-franchise best with 11 in 2014. The following season, Arizona established a new franchise record with 13 wins, which also featured the team's first-ever postseason bye and second-ever appearance in the NFC Championship Game.

Under Arians, the Cardinals offense set several single-season team records, including points scored (489 in 2015), total touchdowns (59 in 2015), total net yards (6,533 in 2015) and first downs (373 in 2015). Arians also helped coach individual players to some of the best seasons of their careers. In 2015, Cardinals quarterback Carson Palmer set franchise records for passing yards (4,671), passing touchdowns (35), yards per attempt (8.70) and passer rating (104.6) en route to a Pro Bowl selection. In 2016, running back David Johnson established new team records for rushing touchdowns (16), total touchdowns (20) and yards from scrimmage (2,118), while leading the NFL in total touchdowns and yards from scrimmage. Wide receiver Larry Fitzgerald posted the top three seasons for receptions in Cardinals history under Arians and ranked third in the NFL in catches during that span.

Arians came to Arizona after spending the 2012 season with Indianapolis. Hired as the team's offensive coordinator, he also served as the team's interim coach for 12 games while head coach Chuck Pagano was treated for leukemia. He led the Colts to a 9-3 record and was selected as the 2012 AP NFL Coach of the Year. Indianapolis' nine-win improvement (2-14 to 11-5) matched the third-largest single-season turnaround in NFL history.

Arians helped the Colts' offense rank 10th in the NFL in yards (362.4 ypg) and seventh in passing yards (258.0 ypg). Rookie quarterback Andrew Luck – the first overall pick in the 2012 NFL Draft – made the Pro Bowl and set rookie records for passing yards (4,374) and 300-yard passing games (six). He also established the NFL single-game rookie record for passing yards (433, 11/4 vs. Miami). Luck finished with the then-third-most passing touchdowns by a rookie in NFL history, with 23.

BRUCE ARIANS

Prior to his time with the Colts, Arians spent eight seasons with the Steelers, five as offensive coordinator (2007-11) and three as the wide receivers coach (2004-06). During his tenure as the offensive coordinator, the Steelers had a 55-25 record, tying Green Bay for the second-best mark in the NFL during that span. Pittsburgh won three AFC North Division titles, two AFC Championships and earned a victory in Super Bowl XLIII over the Cardinals. Arians was also part of the Steelers' Super Bowl XL win as the team's wide receivers coach.

Under Arians' guidance, Steelers quarterback Ben Roethlisberger put together some of the best seasons in team history, establishing a then-franchise record with 32 touchdown passes in 2007, recording a then-team record 4,328 passing yards in 2009 and registering a career-high and Steelers-record 104.1 passer rating in 2007. Roethlisberger earned his first career Pro Bowl selection in 2007 under Arians.

In 2009, the Steelers' offense became the first team in NFL history to have a 4,000-yard passer (Roethlisberger), two 1,000-yard receivers (Antonio Holmes, Hines Ward) and a 1,000-yard rusher (Rashard Mendenhall) in the same season.

Before joining the Steelers, Arians spent three seasons as the offensive coordinator for the Cleveland Browns (2001-03). He joined Cleveland after spending three seasons with the Colts as the team's quarterbacks coach. Working with offensive coordinator Tom Moore, Arians helped tutor Peyton Manning during his first three seasons in the league and helped him earn Pro Bowl berths in 1999 and 2000.

Arians' first NFL job was with the Kansas City Chiefs, working as the team's running backs coach for four seasons (1989-92). There he helped Christian Okoye to two Pro Bowl selections (1989, 1991). Arians also spent the 1996 season as the tight ends coach for the New Orleans Saints.

Arians' coaching career began as a graduate assistant at his alma mater, Virginia Tech, in 1975, before being elevated to running backs coach in 1977. He spent 1978-80 with Mississippi State as the school's running backs/wide receivers coach before coaching the running backs at Alabama for two seasons (1981-82) under legendary coach Paul "Bear" Bryant. Arians would later return to Mississippi State (1993-95) and Alabama (1997) to serve as the offensive coordinator for the respective schools. He became one of the youngest head coaches in Division I history when Temple University hired him in 1983 at the age of 30. He spent six seasons coaching the Owls (1983-88).

Born in Paterson, New Jersey, Arians grew up in York, Pennsylvania, and played quarterback at Virginia Tech. He and his wife, Christine, have two children – son, Jake, and daughter, Kristi Anne, as well as a granddaughter, Presley, and a grandson, Aiden.

SEAN PAYTON



Since he was hired as head coach of the New Orleans Saints in 2006, Sean Payton has established himself as one of the most successful coaches in the NFL. Since coming to New Orleans, Payton has led the Saints to seven playoff berths, five NFC South division titles and the franchise's first World Championship with a 31-17 win over the Indianapolis Colts in Super Bowl XLIV.

Entering 2019, Payton's 126 combined regular season and postseason wins in his NFL head coaching career were tied for the 31st most in NFL history. Payton holds the club's top win total and winning percentage for a head coach.

Payton is one of just seven active coaches to lead a team to a Super Bowl victory. The others are New England's Bill Belichick, Seattle's Pete Carroll, Baltimore's John Harbaugh, Green Bay's Mike McCarthy, Oakland's Jon Gruden and Pittsburgh's Mike Tomlin.

Payton has presided over the NFL's most prolific offense since his arrival, leading the league in net yards per game in 2006, 2008, 2009, 2011, 2014 and 2016 and finishing first in scoring in 2008 and 2009.

In 2018, Payton led the Saints to back-to-back division titles for the first time in franchise history, as New Orleans captured the NFC South crown with a 13-3 record, including 7-1 on the road

Payton was hired as the 14th head coach in Saints history on Jan. 18, 2006 after serving as a member of the Dallas Cowboys coaching staff from 2003-05 under 2013 Pro Football Hall of Fame inductee Bill Parcells. Prior to his final season with the Cowboys, Payton was promoted to assistant head coach/passing game coordinator and was responsible for the team's play-calling after serving as assistant head coach/quarterbacks from 2003-04.

Payton went to Dallas following four years with the New York Giants (1999-2002), the last three as offensive coordinator after spending his first season as quarterbacks coach.

Payton wrapped two coaching stints at San Diego State University (1988-89 and 1992-93) around a stop at Indiana State (1990-91). During his second stretch with the Aztecs, Payton was running backs coach, working with Heisman Trophy runner-up Marshall Faulk before becoming quarterbacks coach.

Following the 1993 season, Payton moved to Miami (Ohio) (1994-95) where he was quarterbacks coach. He spent 1996 as quarterbacks coach at Illinois before entering the NFL with Philadelphia.

Payton earned a bachelor's degree in communications at Eastern Illinois, where as a quarterback he had 10,665 passing yards, then the third-highest total in NCAA Division I-AA history. The three-time AP All-American selection had professional stints with Chicago of the Arena Football League, Ottawa of the Canadian Football League and the Chicago Bears in 1987. Payton was inducted into the Eastern Illinois Hall of Fame in September of 2000 and had his jersey retired in a ceremony in September of 2010. He received an honorary doctorate from his alma mater in 2013.

Payton was born Dec. 29, 1963 in San Mateo, Calif., and raised in Naperville, Ill., Payton has a daughter, Meghan and a son, Connor.

Jason Licht was named the fifth general manager of the Tampa Bay Buccaneers on January 21, 2014. Now in his 24th NFL season, including one as a coach, Licht has had a proven track record of success. Since joining the Miami Dolphins front office in 1995, teams that Licht has been a part of have won over 53 percent of their games, including eight seasons with double-digit victories, while making nine playoff appearances and winning eight division titles, four conference championships and one Super Bowl title. OLB **Shaquil Barrett** joined Tampa Bay after spending his first five seasons with the Denver Broncos (2014-18), including winning Super Bowl 50. In the first five years of his career, Barrett played in 61 regular season games, with 15 starts, registering 137 tackles, including 25 for loss, 14.0 sacks, seven forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries. He played in four postseason games, recording three tackles.


During the Broncos 2015 Super Bowl season, Barrett tied for second in the NFL in forced fumbles with four on the season.

Since joining the Buccaneers, Barrett has made an immediate impact in Tampa Bay. Barrett currently leads the NFL with 9.0 sacks through three games, tying an NFL record, while also generating four takeaways (three forced fumbles, one interception). Barrett was named NFC Defensive Player of the Week for his performance in Week 2 at Carolina.



LB/S **Deone Bucannon** joined Tampa Bay after spending the previous five seasons with the Arizona Cardinals (2014-18). He was the 27th overall selection in the first round of the 2014 NFL Draft by the Cardinals and went on to play in 70 games, making 56 starts, over his five years in Arizona. He was a member of the NFL All-Rookie Team in 2014.

Bucannon is very familiar with the current Buccaneers staff as he played for Head Coach Bruce Arians, Defensive Coordinator Todd Bowles and Outside Linebackers Coach Larry Foote during his time in Arizona. Foote helped the former Washington State safety transition into a hybrid linebacker/safety at the professional level. Entering 2019, he had recorded 404 tackles, 27 tackles for loss, 7.0 sacks, seven forced fumbles, five fumble recoveries, two interceptions and one defensive touchdown.




WR **Breshad Perriman** came to Tampa Bay after finishing the 2018 NFL season with the Cleveland Browns. Originally a first-round pick (26th overall) in the 2015 NFL Draft by the Baltimore Ravens, Perriman played in 37 career games making 59 receptions for 916 yards and five touchdowns prior to joining the Buccaneers.

Perriman was a three-year player at the University of Central Florida in Orlando. His 19.5 yards per reception at UCF set a new school record for the Golden Knights.



P **Bradley Pinion** came to Tampa Bay after spending his first four seasons with the San Francisco 49ers (2015-18). He originally entered the NFL as a fifth-round pick (165th overall) by the 49ers in the 2015 NFL Draft. The former Clemson Tiger was the lone specialist selected in the draft that year.

Entering the season, Pinion had driven 334 punts for a combined 14,559 yards over his 64 career games. His 112 punts inside the 20 were the fifth-most of any punter since he entered the league in 2015. Pinion accumulated 13,359 net punt yards over that span, which ranked second behind only Rams P Johnny Hekker.



DL **Ndamukong Suh** joined the Buccaneers after spending the 2018 season with the Los Angeles Rams. In 16 games for the Super Bowl runners-up, Suh recorded 59 tackles, 19 quarterback hits, 4.5 sacks, four tackles for loss and two fumble recoveries. In the Rams' three playoff games, including Super Bowl LIII, Suh notched six tackles, five quarterback hits, two tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks.


Throughout the first nine years of his career, Suh played in and started 142 games, missing just two games over those nine seasons. The three-time All-Pro and five-time Pro Bowl defensive lineman amassed 481 tackles, 107 tackles for loss, 56.0 sacks, four forced fumbles, four fumble recoveries and one interception in his career. Suh was the NFL AP Defensive Rookie of the Year in 2010 for the Detroit Lions, after being selected second overall by the Lions in the 2010 NFL Draft out of the University of Nebraska.

Suh's 107 tackles for loss entering 2019 were the fifth-most in the NFL since he joined the league in 2010. He also ranked seventh in the NFL during that span with 166 quarterback hits. Among defensive tackles, Suh ranked second in tackles (478), first in tackles for loss (107), third in sacks (56), first in quarterback hits (166) and first in passes defended (32) since 2010.

Since joining the Buccaneers, Suh has made seven tackles (one for loss). He also recovered a fumble for a touchdown in the Buccaneers' win over the Los Angeles Rams in Week 4.



2019 DRAFT PICKS



ILB **Devin White** was chosen fifth overall in the 2019 NFL Draft out of LSU. In his three-year career with the Tigers, White played in 38 games, with 25 starts, totaling 286 tackles (29 for loss), 8.5 sacks, four forced fumbles, four fumble recoveries and an interception.

White won the Butkus Award as a junior (2018), given annually to the nation's top linebacker, after starting 12-of-13 games, recording an SEC-best 123 tackles (12 for loss), six passes defended, 3.0 sacks, three forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. He also earned first-team All-American honors from Walter Camp, Associated Press, Sporting News and the American Football Coaches Association, as well as first-team All-SEC distinction. In his career, he earned six career SEC Defensive Player of the Week Awards (two in 2018, four in 2017), and received the Charles McClendon Award in both 2017 and 2018 as LSU's Most Valuable Player. As a sophomore (2017), White was named second-team All-American and first-team All-SEC, leading the conference in tackles per game (10.2) and ranking second in total tackles (133).



CB **Sean Murphy-Bunting** was selected with the 39th pick in the draft, out of Central Michigan. In his three-year career, Murphy-Bunting started 25-of-38 games played, registering 104 tackles (3.5 for loss), 15 passes defended, nine interceptions, four forced fumbles and one fumble recovery.

In 2018, Murphy-Bunting was named first-team All-Mid-American Conference and earned the Chippewas' Defensive Player of the Year award. In 2017, Murphy-Bunting recorded a career-high five interceptions.




CB **Jamel Dean** was chosen 94th overall, out of Auburn. Dean played in 26 games at Auburn, totaling 73 tackles (4.5 for loss), 17 passes defended, two interceptions and one sack.

Entering the 2018 season, Dean was a preseason All-SEC second-team selection. He tied for the team lead in interceptions, with two, and had the second-most passes defended, with nine. He also ranked second on the team in passes defended in 2018, trailing only former Auburn Tiger and current Buccaneer Carlton Davis.




S **Mike Edwards** was selected 99th overall, out of Kentucky. Edwards did not miss a game in his four-year career with the Wildcats (2014-18), making 51 appearances, with 44 consecutive starts. He earned All-SEC honors three times (2016-18), while being named to the Thorpe Award Watch List twice (2017-18) and the Bronko Nagurski Watch List as a senior (2018). In his career, Edwards recorded 318 tackles (20.5 for loss), 23 passes defended, 10 interceptions, four forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. He ranked second in Kentucky history in tackles by a defensive back, while his 10 career interceptions ranked fourth in school history.




OLB **Anthony Nelson** was the 107th overall selection in the 2019 Draft out of Iowa. Nelson played in 37 games for the Hawkeyes, recording 119 tackles (31 for loss), 23.0 sacks, seven passes defended, four forced fumbles and one fumble recovery, which was recovered in the end zone for a touchdown. In his final season at Iowa — after posting 9.5 sacks, tied for the second-most in the Big Ten and tied for the 17th most in the FBS — Nelson was named second-team All-Big-Ten by the league's media and earned third-team honors from Phil Steele, as well as the league's coaches. He also earned Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week for his effort against Minnesota, after matching a career high with three sacks.



K **Matt Gay** was chosen with the 145th selection. Gay played two seasons at Utah, connecting on 56-of-65 career field goal attempts (86.2 pct.), while also making all 85 extra point attempts. Gay won the Lou Groza Award as the country's top kicker in 2017 and was a semifinalist in 2018. A two-time All-American, Gay also earned first-team All-Pac-12 honors in both of his seasons with the Utes. He ranks third all-time in field goals made, including establishing a school record for field goals of 50-or-more yards made (eight). His career 86.2 field goal percentage ranks second in school history while his 253 kicking points scored rank third. In 2018, Gay set a school record with 21 consecutive made field goals.



WR **Scotty Miller** was the 208th selection in the draft, out of Bowling Green. In his career, Miller started 34-of-45 games played, catching 215 passes for 2,867 yards for 23 touchdowns. A three-time All-MAC selection (first-team 2016, second-team 2018, third-team 2017), Miller finished his career tied for the third-most receptions in school history, while ranking third in receiving yards. In 2018, Miller posted a career-best 1,148 receiving yards, the third-most in a season in school history. His 104.4 receiving yards per game in 2018 ranked him seventh in the FBS.



DL **Terry Beckner Jr. (Practice Squad)** was chosen 215th overall, out of Missouri. Beckner played in 41 games for the Tigers, recording 120 tackles (32 for loss), 13.5 sacks, four passes defended, two fumble recoveries, a forced fumble and one interception, returned 49 yards. In 2018, Beckner led Missouri in tackles for loss (11.0), while ranking second on the team in sacks (3.5). He posted a career-best 7.0 sacks in 2017, which tied for the team lead.
