**THE MATCHUP**

The New Orleans Saints (5-4) will go back on the road seeking improved results at Lincoln Financial Field on Sunday against the Philadelphia Eagles. (4-6) in an important NFC matchup as both teams have their eyes on the postseason with work to do towards that objective.

In 2021, New Orleans is 3-2 on the road after Sunday's 23-21 loss at the Tennessee Titans. Since 2018, the Saints' 23-6 record away from home is tied for the best in the NFL with Kansas City and will be looking to complete the two-game road trip on a winning note before returning to the Caesars Superdome for two consecutive contests.

In the team's loss at the Titans on Sunday, New Orleans nearly completely overcame a 23-12 deficit with 10:01 remaining in the contest. New Orleans kicked a field goal with 5:35 remaining in the contest. The Saints then forced a Titans punt quickly, powered by linebacker **Kwon Alexander's** stop of Tennessee running back **Adrian Peterson** for a five-yard loss.

New Orleans then got the ball back with 3:34 remaining and quarterback **Trevor Siemian** led the Saints on a seven-play, 71-yard scoring drive. Among the highlights were a

22-yard completion to wide receiver **Marquez Callaway**, a 17-yard completion on third and five to wide receiver/return specialist **Deonte Harris** and a 15-yard touchdown pass to Callaway on third and 13 with 1:20 remaining. New Orleans was then set back on the two-point conversion attempt by a false start penalty, but Siemian and running back **Mark Ingram II** just missed connection on the conversion. Ingram carried a full load in the contest, tallying a game-high 108 total yards from scrimmage and a 13-yard rushing touchdown as he became the franchise's all-time rushing leader. Defensively, defensive end **Marcus Davenport** tied a career-high with two sacks as he moved into a tie for the team lead with four quarterback takedowns.

In addition to this being crucial for positioning in a tight NFC race, the NFC South division lead also remains in front of New Orleans. A Saints win in Philadelphia, combined with a Tampa Bay Buccaneers loss to the New York Giants on Monday Night Football, would put the Saints into a tie for first place, with the Saints having captured the first matchup of 2021 between the two rivals.

This Week In The NFC South: The Atlanta Falcons host the New England Patriots on Thursday Night Football, the Tampa Bay Buccaneers host the New York Giants on Monday Night Football and the Carolina Panthers host the Washington Football Team on Sunday.

SERIES HISTORY

The New Orleans Saints and Philadelphia Eagles first met on November 5, 1967, with New Orleans posting a 31-24 victory at Tulane Stadium. It was the first win in franchise history, coming in Week eight of the Saints' inaugural season. The Eagles lead the regular season series 17-12, with the Saints holding a 3-1 edge in the playoffs. The Saints are 3-10 in games played in Philadelphia in the regular season and 1-0 in the playoffs. .

14 of the games in the Saints-Eagles series counting both the regular season and the playoffs have been decided by a touchdown or less, with eight decided by three points or less:

LAST MEETING

Philadelphia Eagles 24, New Orleans Saints 21; December 13, 2020 @ Lincoln Financial Field – The Saints rebounded from a lethargic first half to outscore Philadelphia 21-7 in the final two quarters with a comeback almost complete, but linebacker **Craig Robertson**'s valiant effort to recover an onside kick fell short with 1:24 remaining and the Eagles barely walked away with a 24-21 victory. Philadelphia opened a 17-0 lead on three second quarter possessions, as their rushing attack gained 173 yards in the first half. New Orleans then started the third quarter by getting the Eagles off the field on a three-and-out and quarterback **Taysom Hill** engineered a ten-play, 65-yard drive that ended with a five-yard rushing touchdown by running back **Alvin Kamara**. The Saints defense would get the Eagles off the field again, when linebacker **Kwon Alexander** and safety **Marcus Williams** stopped Philadelphia quarterback **Jalen Hurts** for no gain up the middle on fourth-and-one. Four plays later, Hill connected with wide receiver **Emmanuel Sanders** for a 37-yard touchdown. The Eagles scored midway through the fourth quarter on a one-yard rushing touchdown by Philadelphia running back **Miles Sanders**. When New Orleans got the ball back, Hill was sacked on third and eight by Eagles defensive lineman **Javon Hargrave**, forcing an unsuccessful 57-yard field goal attempt. But two plays later, Alexander stripped the ball from Hurts and it was recovered by safety **Malcolm Jenkins**. Hill drove the Saints three plays later to seven points on a 20-yard touchdown pass to tight end **Jared Cook**, but time would run out after the unsuccessful onside attempt as the Eagles would knee on downs for the 24-21 win.

SAINTS-EAGLES CONNECTIONS

Saints Head Coach **Sean Payton** spent part of his childhood in the Philadelphia area and served on the Eagles coaching staff from 1997-98 as their quarterbacks coach...Saints Special Teams Coordinator **Darren Rizzi** coached the Rutgers special teams units from 2002-07, also tutoring the running backs his first three and the linebackers his final three. Rizzi tutored Eagles Special Teams Coordinator **Michael Clay** in Miami as a rookie in 2013 in Miami, where he was competing for a roster spot...Saints Assistant Special Teams Coach **Phil Galiano** is a Philadelphia native who prepped at Norristown Area (Pa.) HS, played college football at Shippensburg University and also coached at Dickinson, Villanova, Rutgers and Penn State...New Orleans Senior Defensive Assistant **Peter Giunta** served as defensive backs coach of the Eagles from 1991-94 and also served on staffs at Penn State from 1981-83 and at Lehigh from 1988-90...Saints safety **Malcolm Jenkins** played for Philadelphia from 2014-

19...New Orleans defensive end **Tanoh Kpassagnon** prepped at Wissahickon (Ambler, Penn.) HS and then played at Villanova, where he was the CAA defensive player of the year as a senior with 11 sacks, double-majored in accounting and finance...Eagles running back **Boston Scott** prepped at Zachary (La.) HS, played at Louisiana Tech and was a sixth round draft pick of the Saints in 2018, spending the majority of his rookie season on the Black and Gold practice squad....Saints linebacker **Demario Davis** and Eagles quarterback **Gardner Minshew** both prepped at Brandon (Miss.) HS...Saints running back **Mark Ingram II**'s father **Mark Ingram Sr.** finished his NFL career with the Eagles in 1996...New Orleans tackle **Ryan Ramsey**, linebacker **Zack Baun** and Philadelphia linebacker **T.J. Edwards** teammates at the University of Wisconsin...New Orleans wide receiver **Juwan Johnson** and punter **Blake Gillikin** were college teammates at Penn State...Saints running back **Alvin Kamara**, wide receiver **Marquez Callaway**, defensive tackle **Shy Tuttle** and Eagles defensive end **Derek Barnett** were college teammates at the University of Tennessee...Saints Pro Scout **Justin Matthews** is a Cherry Hill, N.J. native...New Orleans cornerback **Paulson Adebo**, Philadelphia wide receiver **J.J. Arcega-Whiteside** and guard **Nate Herbig** were college teammates at Stanford...Saints wide receiver **Kenny Stills** and Philadelphia tackle **Lane Johnson** were college teammates at Oklahoma...Eagles wide receiver **Devonta Smith** prepped at Amite (La.) HS. Ingram and Smith both captured the Heisman Trophy at the University of Alabama...Eagles wide receiver **Quez Watkins** was a two-time first-team All-Conference USA pick at Southern Mississippi...New Orleans linebacker **Andrew Dowell** and Philadelphia cornerback **Josiah Scott** were college teammates at Michigan State...New Orleans Vice President of Football Administration **Khai Harley** served as an administrative intern in Philadelphia from 2001-02...New Orleans Football Administration Associate **Tosen Eyetsemitan** played football at Penn...Saints defensive end **Marcus Epps** and Eagles free safety **Marcus Epps** were college teammates at Wyoming...Eagles linebacker **Davion Taylor** prepped at South Pike (Magnolia, Miss.) HS...Philadelphia Vice President of Player Personnel **Andy Weidl** was a member of the Saints player personnel department from 2000-05, serving as both a combine scout and area scout...Saints Area Scout **Jon Sandusky** played safety at Penn State from 1996-99 and served nine years in the Philadelphia player personnel department...New Orleans Area Scout **Joey Vitt**'s grew up in the Philadelphia area, when his father Joe Vitt coached linebackers for the Eagles from 1995-98...New Orleans Senior Scouting Consultant **Scott Campbell**'s father Marion, served as defensive coordinator of the Eagles from 1977-82 and as head coach from 1983-85...Linebacker **Pete Werner**'s father Greg went to training camp with the Eagles in 1990.

THE HEAD COACHES

Sean Payton has posted a 157-93 overall record (.628), including a 9-8 postseason mark after the franchise had won only one playoff game prior to his arrival in 2006. Payton holds the club's top victory total and winning percentage. Payton is ranked 22nd all-time in National Football League records in victories, fifth among active coaches. He continues to represent the Saints as the model of stability not only within the NFC South, as he is the longest tenured head coach within the conference, but also among the most accomplished within the NFL. Only Bill Belichick (2000) has been with his team longer than Payton's 15 seasons. Payton is also one of just eight active NFL head coaches to lead a team to a Super Bowl victory. The others are the Tampa Bay Buccaneers' Bruce Arians, Belichick, the Seattle Seahawks' Pete Carroll, the Baltimore Ravens' John Harbaugh, the Dallas Cowboys' Mike McCarthy (Green Bay in 2010), Kansas City's Andy Reid and Tomlin. The 2020 Saints were only the sixth team in National Football League history to have six-game winning streaks in four consecutive seasons and with a nine-game winning streak had won at least nine straight games in two of the past three seasons and had double-digit victory figures and consecutive playoff berths in four straight years for the first time in team history, also being only the third NFC team since divisional alignment to capture four straight division championships. The Black and Gold qualified for the NFL playoffs for the ninth season (2006, 2009-11, 2013, 2017-20) in Payton's head coaching tenure). Payton earned a degree in communications at Eastern Illinois, where as a quarterback he had 10,665 passing yards, at the time the third-highest total in NCAA Division I-AA history. Payton was inducted into the Eastern Illinois Hall of Fame in 2000 and had his jersey retired in a ceremony in 2010. He received an honorary doctorate from his alma mater in 2013. Payton was born December 29, 1963 in San Mateo, Calif., and raised in Naperville, Ill., Payton has a daughter, Meghan and a son, Connor.

Nick Sirianni was named head coach of the Eagles on January 24, 2021, following a productive, three-year stint as the Indianapolis Colts' offensive coordinator. With Sirianni directing the Colts' offense, Indianapolis ranked sixth in third-down conversions (43.4 pct.), seventh in red zone touchdown efficiency (63.9 pct.) and eighth in offensive points per game (24.4), while surrendering the second-fewest sacks (71) in the league, during the 2018-20 seasons. In that span, the Colts combined for a 28-20 record (.583 winning percentage), including a pair of 10-plus-win campaigns, and made two playoff appearances.

During an 11-5 season in 2020, Sirianni oversaw a Colts offense that posted the 10th-most total yards per game (378.1) in the NFL and allowed the second-fewest sacks (21, tied) as well as the third-fewest giveaways (15). In his

age 39 season, QB Philip Rivers posted the eighth-highest completion percentage (68.0 pct.) and 10th-most passing yards (4,169) in the league, adding 24 touchdown passes and a 97.0 passer rating. Additionally, rookie RB Jonathan Taylor (1,169 yards) ranked third among the league's rushing leaders, trailing Derrick Henry (2,027) and Dalvin Cook (1,557), and tied for the most rushing scores (11) by a rookie since Ezekiel Elliott in 2016 (15).

Prior to joining the Colts, Sirianni spent five years (2013-17) as a member of the Los Angeles/San Diego Chargers' coaching staff, including two seasons as wide receivers coach (2016-17). From 2014-15, Sirianni coached the Chargers' quarterbacks and helped Rivers earn consecutive Pro Bowls while averaging 30 passing touchdowns per season. Sirianni began his NFL coaching career with the Kansas City Chiefs (2009-12), serving as wide receivers coach (2012) and offensive quality control coach (2009-11). He also worked with Chiefs quarterbacks in 2010 and helped Matt Cassel receive his first career Pro Bowl after producing 3,116 passing yards, 27 touchdowns (against seven interceptions) and a career-high 93.0 passer rating.

Before entering the NFL coaching ranks, Sirianni spent five years at the collegiate level as wide receivers coach at Indiana University of Pennsylvania (2006-08) and as defensive backs coach at Mount Union (2004-05), his alma mater, where he helped the Purple Raiders capture a national title during the 2005 season.

Sirianni and his wife, Brett, have two sons, Jacob and Miles, and one daughter, Taylor.

GAME SUMMARIES

Week 1: Saints 38, Packers 3; September 12, 2021 @ TIAA Bank Field (Jacksonville, Fla.) – Jameis Winston and the hurricane-displaced Saints looked right at home in northeast Florida — no doubt to the delight of fans rebuilding homes and lives back in New Orleans.

Winston passed for five touchdowns, New Orleans intercepted reigning NFL Most Valuable Player Aaron Rodgers twice, and the Saints kicked off the post-Drew Brees era with a strikingly dominant 38-3 victory over the Green Bay Packers.

"We knew that even though some people don't have power, they're going to find a way to watch the Saints," linebacker and captain Demario Davis said. "That's just what this team means to the city — and the city means the same to us."

The game, originally scheduled for the Superdome, was moved while the New Orleans area continues to clean up wreckage left by Hurricane Ida, which struck southeast Louisiana as a Category 4 storm on Aug. 29, 16 years to the day after Hurricane Katrina devastated the same region.

After canceling their final preseason game and practicing two weeks in the Dallas area, the Saints looked as sharp and inspired as any club with such distractions could have hoped.

"That was for the city," Winston said. "We did that for them. We knew how much it would mean to get a great victory for that region. They've been through so much. ... Hats off to them for their resilience, because they motivated us. They inspired us to come out there and ball."

Winston, who led the NFL with 30 interceptions in his last season as a starter with Tampa Bay in 2019, was largely judicious and accurate in going an efficient 14 of 20 for 148 yards without an interception. New Orleans also rushed for 171 yards.

"Drew always preached, it's about the decision, not the result," Winston said, alluding to last season, when he served as a reserve and understudy to Brees in an effort to improve the long-term trajectory of his up-and-down career. "Sometimes the decision is throwing the ball away, sometimes the decision is running, tucking. Sometimes the decision may be taking a sack."

Winston didn't take a sack, but did take off and run for a few key third-down conversions in the first half.

The only risky throw that backfired on him, a deflected pass caught by Packers defensive back Darnell Savage in the end zone — was negated by a contested roughing-the-passer penalty called against edge rusher Z'Darius Smith.

The penalty set up the second touchdown catch of the game by Juwan Johnson, who came in with four career catches and was converted from receiver to a tight end this offseason.

On the day before his 25th birthday, Johnson also converted a screen pass into a 12-yard, first-down gain on fourth-and-7 in the second quarter, when the game was still

in doubt. He capped that drive with a leaping catch in the end zone on fourth-and-two. The two fourth down conversions highlighted a pivotal 14-play drive that consumed 10 minutes.

"You've got to pick your spots where you want to be aggressive and it's a little bit easier on that end of the field," Payton said. "I felt pretty good about the calls."

Green Bay fans seemed to outnumber Saints fans in a crowd announced at 35,242 for what was officially a Saints home game. But they left disappointed in a day that could not have gone much worse for Rodgers, who was pulled with nearly 11 minutes left.

As the time expired, the remaining Saints fans joined in triumphant chants of "Who Dat!" that echoed throughout the stadium.

"This is a good kick in the you-know-where," said Rodgers, who finished 15 of 28 for 133 yards and no TDs. "We felt like we were going to go up and down the field on whoever they have and that obviously wasn't the case."

Opening the third quarter down 17-3, the Packers squandered a chance to trim their deficit when Rodgers' wobbly pass under pressure was intercepted by rookie defensive back Paulson Adebo at the New Orleans 7 early in the third quarter.

On Green Bay's next drive, Marcus Williams intercepted Rodgers' deep overthrow and returned it to the Packers 12, setting up Winston's 10-yard TD to Chris Hogan.

"Every team has a game like this," said Packers running back Aaron Jones, who was limited to 9 yards on five carries. "It's better to get it out now."

FAST START

The Saints did not punt in the first half.

New Orleans took the opening kickoff for a field goal and led 10-0 after Alvin Kamara took a short forward pitch from Winston as he crossed behind the offensive line, then slipped multiple tackle attempts to squirm into the end zone from 3 yards. That officially went down as Winston's first regular-season TD pass as a Saint, and he helped set it up with a 10-yard scramble on third-and-8.

Week 2: Carolina Panthers 26, Saints 7; September 19, 2021 @ Bank of America Stadium – The Carolina Panthers, a week after their season-opening win over the New York Jets, continued to take advantage of home cooking and handed the Saints a 26-7 defeat on a warm afternoon at Bank of America Stadium.

Carolina quarterback **Sam Darnold** was impressive and efficient throughout the majority of the game, completing 26-of-38 passes for 305 yards with two touchdown passes, one interception and a 99.1 rating. But Darnold wasn't the lone story of the day, as a healthy **Christian McCaffrey** gained 137 total yards from scrimmage and one rushing touchdown.

The Panthers defense seemingly took away most of the Saints' big play abilities, with New Orleans' longest play a 27-yard connection between quarterback **Jameis Winston** and wide receiver **Lil' Jordan Humprey**. New Orleans struggled running the ball (17 carries for 48 yards) and on early downs, resulting in unfavorable situations and production on third down (2-for-11) and losing the time of possession battle 38:32-21:28. **CONTINUED ON NEXT PAGE**

Defensively, LB **Demario Davis** led the club with 12 tackles, while a pair of young defensive linemen in DT **Malcolm Roach** and DE **Payton Turner** recorded their first career interception and sack respectively.

The New Orleans special teams units also worked to keep the Saints in the hunt on a day of tough sledding. P **Blake Gillikin** pinned the Panthers back several times, recording a 45.0 net punting average on six punts with a 60-yard punt. WR **Ty Montgomery** had a career-high three coverage stops. Midway through the third quarter, DE **Carl Granderson**, who had made his first career start on defense, blocked a 55-yard field goal attempt by K **Zane Gonzalez** and it was recovered and returned by LB **Zack Baun**. WR/RS **Deonte Harris** returned five kickoffs for a career-high 156 yards, running back a kick late in the second quarter 39 yards.

Week 3: Saints 28, Patriots 13; September 26, 2021 @ Gillette Stadium – Only one brand of football comes to mind when Jameis Winston thinks about the best New Orleans Saints teams of the past.

"Saints football has always been efficiency and physicality up front," he said. "That's all I know. They win up front and they play tough. That's what we did here."

Winston threw two touchdown passes, Malcolm Jenkins returned an interception for a score, and the Saints beat the Patriots 28-13 on Sunday.

A week after a career-low passer rating Winston showed better command of the offense, completing 13 of 21 passes for 128 yards. Taysom Hill ran for a touchdown and Alvin Kamara rushed 24 times for 89 yards and had a receiving TD. He got support from a defense that made Patriots rookie quarterback's life miserable.

Mac Jones entered the day hoping to stretch the field after two games in which the passing attack was mostly underneath. Instead, he found himself under pressure for most of the day and threw three interceptions, two leading to Saints touchdowns. New Orleans sacked Jones three times and hit him 11 times. He finished 30 of 51 for 270 yards and a touchdown.

"I think it just goes back to execution," Jones said. "I can do a better job just sticking to my reads and being patient and letting things develop. I didn't do a good job of that today." Saints safety P.J. Williams returned Jones' first pick of the day 46 yards to set up a 7-yard TD pass by Winston in the second quarter.

Jenkins was the beneficiary of the second INT, snaring a pass bobbled by tight end Jonnu Smith. He returned it 34 yards and put the Saints in front 21-3.

The Patriots cut it to 21-13 following Jones' 22-yard TD pass to Kendrick Bourne with 9:22 left in the fourth period. The Saints responded with a 13-play, 75-yard drive that ate up 6:45 and ended with a 4-yard run by Hill.

Saints coach Sean Payton harped all week on the Patriots' impressive 108-7 record at home (including playoffs) since 2000 when they win the turnover battle. He said having a plus-3 differential Sunday was huge.

"We're mindful of it every week, but it had to be something that was put in our heads every day," he said. "I thought we

took care of the football. I thought that was important." New Orleans overcame an early injury to take a 14-3 lead into halftime.

The Saints' offensive line was already down one starter with center Erik McCoy (calf) ruled out. They lost another early in the first quarter after left tackle Terron Armstead exited with a left elbow injury.

But after going three-and-out on their opening drive, the Saints got efficient, sweeping down the field mixing runs and passes, and a long third-down conversion to get inside the red zone. Winston then put a bow on the 11-play, 69-yard drive with an 11-yard touchdown pass to Kamara. The Saints turned defense into offense for their second score.

The Patriots had third down near midfield when linebacker Kaden Ellis pressured Jones, forcing a pass that was tipped and intercepted by Williams. He returned it 46 yards to the Patriots 9.

Three plays later Winston connected with Marquez Callaway for a 7-yard touchdown.

"There's no magic sauce here," Belichick said. "Just have to go back to work and do better."

Week 4: Giants 27, Saints 21; October 3, 2021 @ Caesars Superdome – The New York Giants spoiled the New Orleans Saints' Dome-coming party as they won a 27-21 overtime game in the Caesars Superdome.

Down 21-10 with 12 minutes to play quarterback Daniel Jones started the comeback by hitting Barkley on a 54-yard scoring play with 6:52 to play. Jones ran it in for the 2-point conversion to make it 21-18. Jones then led the Giants on a late drive to tie the score at 21 when kicker Graham Gano made a 48-yard field goal with 31 seconds to play. The Giants (1-3) won the coin toss and took the ball to start the 10-minute overtime period and marched down the field, ending it with a powerful run by Barkley. Jones finished 28 of 40 for 402 yards with two touchdown passes and one interception. Barkley had 13 carries for 52 yards and the game-winning touchdown.

The loss dropped the Saints to 2-2 and ruined the team's first game in front of a full home crowd in 637 days. The scheduled home opener was moved to Jacksonville because of damage to the area from Hurricane Ida and the team had been training in Dallas until Sept. 24. The Saints had seemed to be in command of the game thanks to their quarterbacks, Jameis Winston and Taysom Hill.

Winston handled the passing-17 of 23 for 226 yards and a touchdown-while Hill took care of the rushing, powering in for two 8-yard touchdown runs.

The loss ruined one of the best games of RB Alvin Kamara's five-year career. He recorded his fourth 100-yard rushing game, carrying a career-high 26 times for 120 yards. Hill finished with 28 yards on six carries and caught two passes for 26 yards.

GAME SUMMARIES

Week 5: Saints 33, Washington Football Team 22; October 10, 2021 @ FedEx Field

After Jameis Winston connected with Marquez Callaway on a Hail Mary touchdown on the final play of the first half, Sean Payton recalled a similar play in his first season as Saints coach.

15 years ago, his team's Hail Mary in Atlanta overshadowed a halftime performance by country music duo Sugarland. Payton thought to himself: "If there was any halftime entertainment, that's a tough spot to be in."

This one was even sweeter. The Hail Mary was one of Winston's four touchdown passes to help the Saints beat Washington 33-22 for a bounce-back victory.

"Turnovers are going to happen — you just don't want the trickle-down effect to happen," said Winston, who completed 15 of 30 passes for 279 yards and made up for an inexplicable interception on the first possession and a fumble on Chase Young's first sack of the season. "We played efficient football. We made plays when we needed it."

The win came at a cost with two more injuries. Winston took every snap at quarterback for the first time, a necessity after Taysom Hill suffered a concussion.

Winston completed a 72-yard TD pass to Deonte Harris, who departed (hamstring). He also connected with Callaway on the 49-yard Hail Mary TD, found him wide open from 12 yards out early in the fourth quarter and sent Washington fans to the exits with a pass to Alvin Kamara that turned into a 19-yard score. Kamara also had a 23-yard TD run, returned punts in Harris' absence and racked up 151 total yards.

"Any time I'm catching the ball, I love it," said Kamara, who didn't have a reception last week in the overtime loss to the New York Giants. "I think it adds an aspect to our offense. We had an opportunity to do that."

The Saints picked off Taylor Heinicke twice and put some pressure on him a week after not sacking the Giants. Antonio Gibson ran for two TDs, but Washington could not outscore another rough performance by its defense.

Week 7: Saints 13, Seahawks 10; October 25, 2021 @ Lumen Field

Alvin Kamara and Jameis Winston were the happy beneficiaries of the Seahawks' many mistakes. Then it was rookie Brian Johnson's turn to make sure the Saints got the win they needed to keep pace in the NFC South.

"In a game like this where things are close, things get a little a little ugly towards the end, it builds confidence to be able to come into a game like this and close it out the way we did," Saints DE Cameron Jordan said.

Johnson kicked a 33-yard field goal with 1:56 left in his NFL debut, and New Orleans outlasted Seattle 13-10. Kamara carried the load for New Orleans and Winston made a handful of plays when needed, but the Saints escaped Seattle thanks largely to a series of Seahawks blunders, which is sorely missing injured QB Russell Wilson.

Two of the Seahawks' biggest mistakes came on New Orleans' deciding drive when Seattle was flagged for roughing the passer and jumping offside on a long field-goal attempt. Both penalties gave New Orleans first downs, and Johnson's field goal coming out of the 2-minute warning put the Saints ahead.

Johnson, a rookie, made a PAT and both field-goal tries, connecting from 21 yards in the first half.

"It was tough trying to see what the wind was doing because it was changing constantly throughout pregame and the game itself," Johnson said. "So just stick with my plan I had coming into it and really focusing on just hitting my ball and hitting good contact that will cut through the wind."

Geno Smith made his second start at QB for Seattle (2-5) since Wilson suffered a serious finger injury in a loss to the Rams. The backup hit DK Metcalf for an 84-yard touchdown in the first quarter but went nowhere when the Seahawks had a final chance to tie or win.

Smith was sacked on consecutive plays by Malcolm Jenkins and Demario Davis. On fourth-and-28, Smith was pressured again and his throw to Metcalf fell incomplete. Smith went 12 of 22 for 167 yards — half coming on the TD toss to Metcalf — and was sacked five times as Davis, Cameron Jordan and others made his night uncomfortable. Seattle's lost three straight for the first time since 2011 and fell to 0-3 at home for the first time since 1992. Although both defeats with Smith under center have been by three points, the Seahawks aren't the same without Wilson.

"I've been here a long time and if we didn't have Russell, I probably wouldn't have been here a long time because of all the magic he has created over the years," coach Pete Carroll said.

Kamara finished with 10 catches for 128 yards and a 13-yard TD reception late in the first half. It was his fifth career regular-season game with double-digit receptions. He rushed for 51 yards.

Winston was 19 of 35 for 222 yards and added 43 yards rushing. He also made enough plays—thanks to Seattle penalties—to get the Saints in range for the field goal. Seattle appeared to get a stop, but Marquise Blair was called for roughing the passer on a third-down sack after hitting Winston with the crown of his helmet. Kamara then sprinted past a blitz for 12 yards on third-and-10 and the Saints were in field-goal range.

Al Woods jumped offside as Johnson lined up for a 43-yard attempt, allowing New Orleans to burn another 90 seconds off the clock before Johnson made the shorter try.

"We got to get right," Seattle LB Bobby Wagner said.

"We've got to really fix our mistakes, play smarter, make less penalties."

Seattle's Jason Myers missed two field goal attempts — the second into the open end of the stadium after Smith took another costly sack. Myers made a 50-yarder.

Kamara had 21 touches on New Orleans' 39 offensive plays in the first half. He was mostly ineffective on the ground, but Seattle couldn't slow him down in the pass game. He already had 108 yards receiving by halftime. Four of his receptions came on the final drive of the half when his 31-yard catch-and-run out of the backfield set up his 13-yard TD catch and a 10-7 halftime lead.

"Every game has a life of its own, so that was just the flavor of this week, ended up getting a lot of touches," Kamara said.

Week 8: Saints 36, Buccaneers 27; October 31, 2021 @

Caesars Superdome - When Saints quarterback Jameis Winston could no longer walk on his own, his New Orleans teammates rose up in dramatic fashion to knock off Tom Brady and the defending champs.

P.J. Williams intercepted Brady and returned it 40 yards for a touchdown with 1:24 left, helping New Orleans seal an eventful but potentially costly 36-27 victory over the Tampa Bay Buccaneers on Sunday.

Winston injured his left knee during a scramble early in the second quarter when pulled down from behind by former LSU star Devin White, who was flagged for a horse collar tackle.

"I think it's significant," said coach Sean Payton, adding that he cried when he saw Winston in the locker room. "He felt something and is on crutches right now. ... When he got up and then had to go back down, you were a little concerned."

Backup Trevor Siemian took over for Winston and completed 16 of 29 passes for 159 yards and a touchdown without a turnover, leading the Saints on five scoring drives that produced two touchdowns and three field goals.

Payton said he had confidence in Siemian, who'd started for Denver in 2016 and 2017. Payton added his play calling for the duration of the game had more to do with how Tampa Bay was defending than the fact that his backup QB was under center.

"He's an experienced player," Payton said.

Siemian, who last took a meaningful snap in Week 2 of the 2019 season with the New York Jets, said he'd "kind of lost a little bit a sense of how fun it is."

"There's a joy to this game," Siemian said. "There's nothing better than to see your teammates make plays and you're moving the ball and it's the best."

Winston's first start against the team that drafted him first overall in 2015, and then let him go in 2020 when they had a chance to sign Brady, was a subplot of this NFC South clash.

And Winston looked determined to do whatever it took to win, passing for 56 yards and a 14-yard touchdown to TreQuan Smith, and scrambling for 40 yards before his injury. Payton gave Winston a game ball, and teammates lamented his injury.

"It was hard, man, because he worked so hard this offseason," said Williams, Winston's friend since they were teammates at Florida State. "It's tough for me, it's tough for the team and I know it's tough for him. I told him at halftime we were going to go out there and win for him." Brady passed for four TDs, but also turned the ball over three times on a pair of interceptions and a fumble, which the Saints converted into 16 points.

The Bucs nearly overcame their mistakes. They wiped out a 16-point second-half deficit and took a lead with 5:44 to go when receiver and former LSU track athlete Cyril Grayson was left uncovered and Brady found him for a 50-yard touchdown.

New Orleans responded by driving for a field goal and a 29-27 lead with 1:41 left, leaving Brady, no stranger to late-game heroics, that much time plus a timeout to get in field

goal range. Instead, the Saints' defense came up big.

"I just threw it to the wrong guy," Brady said of his late interception. "I had Mike (Evans) open. It cost us the game."

MOMENTUM SWINGS

New Orleans' defense came up with two turnovers in the second quarter after Winston was carted to the locker room, and the Saints' offense converted those into nine points.

Brady fumbled on a double-pump caused by pressure from defensive end Cameron Jordan. Defensive tackle David Onyemata, newly activated after a six-game suspension, recovered near midfield.

The Saints got a field goal, but only after a roughing-the-passer call against William Gholston wiped out what would have been an interception by Antoine Winfield Jr. in the end zone.

Later, Brady was intercepted by C.J. Gardner Johnson, who had left his man to undercut a pass intended for Chris Godwin.

New Orleans capitalized by driving for Siemian's 1-yard pass to fullback Alex Armah shortly before halftime.

The Saints widened their lead to 23-7 on the opening possession of the second half, which began with Siemian hitting Kevin White for a 38-yard gain. Alvin Kamara finished it on a pitch play on fourth-and-goal from the 1.

But Brady responded by leading the Bucs to touchdowns on two straight possessions. He hit RB Giovani Bernard for a 7-yard TD and launched a 41-yard scoring strike to Evans, who beat Marshon Lattimore in single coverage.

STAT LINES

For the Bucs, the loss squandered a prolific day for Godwin, who had eight catches for 144 yards, including a 12-yard touchdown in the first quarter.

The Saints rushed for 152 yards — led by Kamara's 61 — against Tampa Bay's top-ranked run defense, which came in allowing 67.4 yards rushing per game.

The Saints sacked Brady three times: one each by Jordan, Kwon Alexander and Tanoh Kpassagnon.

Week 9: Atlanta Falcons 26, Saints 5; November 7, 2021 @ Caesars Superdome - Matt Ryan's last and longest of several deep completions spared the Atlanta Falcons from another infamous collapse.

Ryan hit Cordarrelle Patterson for a 64-yard gain with a minute left to set up Younghoe Koo's 29-yard field goal as time expired, and Atlanta defeated mistake-prone New Orleans on Sunday after allowing the Saints to wipe out an 18-point, fourth-quarter deficit.

"We just like to give our fans a heart attack, just keep them on their toes to make sure they're paying attention," Patterson joked. "We wanted to put them away early, but it's the Saints; they've got a great team over there. They fought till the end. We did a better job. We got the win, that's all that matters."

Ryan passed for 343 yards, connected twice with Olamide Zaccheaus for touchdowns, and the veteran quarterback also ran for a score on a bootleg as the Falcons (4-4) snapped the Saints' three-game winning streak and prevented New Orleans (5-3) from moving into a tie with Tampa Bay (6-2) atop the NFC South. **CONTINUED ON NEXT PAGE**

"I felt good after that one," Ryan said. "I was excited. We needed to make a play. We needed to win that game. I'm proud of the guys for getting the job done."

Ryan's second scoring pass gave the Falcons a 24-6 lead with 10:39 left in the fourth quarter. But the Saints rallied to briefly take the lead on Trevor Siemian's 8-yard pass to Kenny Stills with 1:01 left.

New Orleans then missed a 2-point conversion try for the second time in the game, leaving the door open for the Falcons to win with a field goal.

"We got it going but it was too little, too late," Siemian said. "You can't spot a team that many scores. I knew there was a lot of time left and the game wasn't over when we scored at the end. You were still holding your breath a little bit."

LOST LEADS

The Falcons have seen their share of blown double-digit leads in recent years — none worse than a Super Bowl loss five seasons ago to the Patriots in overtime after leading 28-3.

The Falcons lost four fourth-quarter leads last season, when they also became the first team in NFL history to lose back-to-back games after leading by 15 or more in the fourth quarter.

And just last December, the Falcons fell to Tampa Bay after leading 24-7.

But against their historical rivals in New Orleans, the Falcons didn't fold. Rather, Ryan pulled off his 41st career comeback.

Ryan needed just one play to burn the Saints' defense for his fourth completion of more than 30 yards in the game — and his second long connection with Patterson. The versatile running back beat rookie Paulson Adebo down the right sideline to give him six catches for 126 yards on the day.

"That's 'Matty Ice,'" Patterson said. "He's not nervous, he's been doing this his whole career."

STATS AND SUCH

Even with top Falcons receiver Calvin Ridley unavailable while addressing mental health issues, Ryan completed 23 of 30 passes without a turnover. Russell Gage caught seven passes for 64 yards, rookie tight end Kyle Pitts caught three for 62 yards and Zaccarias caught three for 58 yards.

Saints head coach Sean Payton started Siemian on the heels of Jameis Winston's season-ending knee injury a week ago, and intermittently mixed in Taysom Hill behind center.

Siemian passed for 249 yards and two touchdowns without an interception, and Hill completed both of his passes for 33 yards. But both quarterbacks were hindered by a combination of penalties, dropped passes and protection breakdowns.

"They played better than us today," Payton said of the Falcons. "We didn't do the things that winning teams do consistently in our league, and we've got to get that corrected."

James Vaughters' blind-side sack and strip of Siemian set up Atlanta's final TD after linebacker Steven Means recovered and returned the fumble 32 yards to the New Orleans 6.

But New Orleans rallied for three straight TDs in the final eight minutes, starting with Siemian's 5-yard pass to Marquez Callaway and Alvin Kamara's 2-yard scoring run with 4:35 to go.

The Saints failed on a 2-point try after Kamara's touchdown, but New Orleans sacked Ryan for the first two times all game to force a punt and set up its late, go-ahead possession.

"You'd love to have a comfortable lead. Everybody wants to be comfortable," Falcons first-year coach Arthur Smith said. "That's not the NFL, not when you're on the road playing a good team."

"Our mindset has been we're going to finish games," Smith added. "This shows more about their mental toughness."

Week 10: Titans 23, Saints 21; November 14, 2021 @

Nissan Stadium - An untimely turnover, a questionable call that took away an end zone interception, two missed extra points and a false start proved too much for the New Orleans Saints to overcome in a 23-21 loss to the Tennessee Titans on Sunday, Nov. 14 at Nissan Stadium in Nashville, Tenn.

It was the Saints' second consecutive loss and dropped them to 5-4. Tennessee improved to 8-2.

The Saints had a chance to send the game to overtime after Trevor Siemian's 15-yard touchdown pass to Marquez Callaway made it 23-21 Tennessee with 1:16 to play. With Taysom Hill in at quarterback for the 2-point play, the Saints were penalized for a false start by tight end Adam Trautman. Siemian came back in and his pass to running back Mark Ingram II from the seven-yard line was incomplete.

The comeback was necessary after New Orleans returner Deonte Harris fumbled the kickoff to start the second half, giving Tennessee the ball at the 19-yard line. The Titans quickly scored on a 2-yard pass from quarterback Ryan Tannehill to MyCole Pruitt, which increased Tennessee's lead to 20-6.

Another key play in the game came when the Saints appeared to have stopped a Tennessee scoring drive in the first half when Marcus Williams intercepted Tannehill in the end zone but the Saints were penalized for roughing the passer by linebacker Kaden Elliss. Later in the drive Demario Davis was called for pass interference, giving Tennessee the ball first and goal at the 1. Tennessee scored on the next play on a dive by Tannehill for a 13-6 halftime lead.

The Saints scored their first touchdown on an 11-yard pass from Siemian to TreQuan Smith in the second quarter. The score was set up by a 46-yard completion to Deonte Harris. Kicker Brian Johnson missed the extra-point attempt, the first of two missed extra points

The former Heisman Trophy winner and 2011 first-round draft pick out of Alabama entered Sunday's game against Tennessee with 6,077 career rushing yards with the Saints, 19 yards behind Saints Hall of Famer Deuce McAllister. Ingram accomplished the mark in the third quarter with a 6-yard run.

1983 - New Orleans falls to 6-6 after a 31-28 loss to the New York Jets on Monday night football as kicker Morten Andersen's 51-yard field goal attempt went wide left despite 239 yards rushing.

1999 - The Saints fell to the Jacksonville Jaguars 41-23 at ALLTELL Stadium..

2004 - The Saints fall to the Denver Broncos 34-14 at the Superdome.

2010 - New Orleans defeats the Seattle Seahawks 34-19 at the Superdome as quarterback Drew Brees passed for 382 yards and four touchdowns and wide receiver Marques Colston had eight grabs for 113 yards and two touchdowns.

2013 - New Orleans improves to 9-2, as they defeat Atlanta 17-13 on Thursday Night Football at the Georgia Dome.

UP NEXT

Following Sunday's game, New Orleans returns to the Caesars Superdome for two consecutive prime time Thursday night contests, starting with a 7:20 kickoff on Thanksgiving night against the Buffalo Bills in a contest nationally televised on NBC. New Orleans leads the all-time series 7-4, winning the last five contests dating back to 2001. The Saints have won all three times they have played on Thanksgiving.

DOUBLE DIGIT WINS

Finishing the 2020 regular season at 12-4, New Orleans has won at least ten games for the ninth time under Payton after posting double-digit win totals only five times from 1967-2005. In 2020, the Saints had the franchise's seventh season of at least 12 wins, five under Payton.

IN THE NFC SOUTH

The Saints have the best record among NFC South teams since 2006, a time where they've won seven division titles including four straight from 2017-20, the most in division history and are only the third NFC team since 2002 to win a division four straight times. They've posted a 58-35 division mark since 2006 and in 2020 became the first team since the NFC South debuted in 2002 to finish the season 6-0 in the division. New Orleans has joined the 2004-07 Seattle Seahawks and 2011-14 Green Bay Packers to become only the third NFC team since divisional realignment in 2002 to win four consecutive division titles.

Below is an overview of players on the club's current 53-man roster with extensive practice squad experience.

After appearing in three regular season games in 2017 and posting two receptions for 12 yards and one touchdown in the 2018 NFC Championship, TE **Garrett Griffin** was elevated to the club's active roster multiple times in 2020, playing in four games with three starts, serving as a blocking presence and has appeared in all seven in 2021, receiving his first start on Sunday vs. Tampa Bay on October 31, posting a career-high three receptions for 30 yards.

RB **Dwayne Washington** participated on the Saints practice squad briefly in 2018 after spending most of the 2016 and 2017 seasons on Detroit's active roster. Through development, the tailback, in addition to his running skills, has developed into a core special teams player with nine stops.

K **Brian Johnson** was signed as an undrafted free agent who went to training camp with Chicago out of Virginia Tech, starting the season on their practice squad. Signed by New Orleans during the bye, Johnson made his NFL regular season debut on Monday Night Football at Seattle, Oct. 25 and drilled a game-winning 33-yard field goal with 1:56 remaining. On Oct. 31 vs. Tampa Bay, Johnson drilled all three of his field goal attempts, including a kick with 1:41 left to put New Orleans ahead. Overall Johnson has drilled all eight field goal attempts with 12 of his 22 kickoffs sailing through the end zone for touchbacks.

TE **Juwan Johnson** was signed by New Orleans out of Oregon, where he spent his graduate transfer season following the 2020 NFL Draft as a wideout. Recording four receptions for 39 yards seven contests, Johnson spent the majority of the season on the practice squad. Ahead is a synopsis of several returning players and newcomers through the draft and free agency to the 2021 Saints offensive line:

LT Terron Armstead - The club's first third round draft choice in 2013 out of Arkansas-Pine Bluff, Armstead impressed scouts by running the fastest 40-yard dash time (4.71) by an offensive lineman in the history of the NFL Scouting Combine. He's opened 91 regular season games and nine postseason contests and has been selected to the Pro Bowl the past three seasons.

RT Ryan Ramczyk - The Black and Gold used their second first round selection in the 2017 NFL Draft to snag Ramczyk out of Wisconsin, one of the best linemen in the entire draft. After opening all 16 games and both postseason contests in 2017 and being selected as a PFWA All-Rookie, he was an AP All-Pro selection in 2018, not missing an offensive snap in both postseason contests and all 15 regular games. Ramczyk opened all 16 games in 2019 to serve as a dominating bookend to Armstead, earning first-team All-Pro. Opening every contest and playing a key role in blocking for a run offense that averaged over 200 yards per game in a three-game stretch for the first time since 2018 in three contests and finished ranked sixth in the league in rushing offense. In 2020, he was selected as a second-team AP All-Pro.

Center/Guard Erik McCoy - New Orleans traded up in the second round of the 2019 NFL Draft to select this standout from Texas A&M, who was a three-year starter, anchoring the middle of the Aggies offensive line. In 2018, he was a team captain who paved the way for the SEC's leading rusher and in 2019 was the first Saint in franchise history to start at center in Week One, opening all 16 regular season contests. McCoy opened all 16 contests and both postseason games in 2020 for the NFL's sixth-ranked rushing offense. McCoy has started four contests at center in 2021.

Guard/Center Cesar Ruiz - The hard-working, talented and intelligent lineman is a perfect fit for New Orleans' culture with the 24th pick in the 2020 NFL Draft out of Michigan. The three-year letterman played in 36 games in college, starting his last 31 including the final 26 at center, earning All-Big Ten in 2019. Ruiz settled in at right guard in the last 15 games, with nine starts, as well as both postseason contests. When McCoy suffered a lower leg injury in the first quarter of the season-opening win over Green Bay, Ruiz transitioned over to his natural position, where the Saints did not give up a sack and has started the past four contests in the middle. He returned to right guard on October 25 at Seattle.

Offensive Lineman Calvin Throckmorton - This 6-5, 309 pound former four-year starter on the Oregon line was signed as an undrafted free agent in 2020, possessing the flexibility to play all five positions along the offensive line. After spending his rookie season on the practice squad, Throckmorton increased strength in the 2021 offseason and made strides in training camp, securing a roster spot. In his NFL debut in the season opening-win, Throckmorton was called to play right guard following a lower leg injury to McCoy in the first quarter, subsequently starting the past

four contests. He then moved into left guard on October 25 at Seattle following a shoulder injury to Andrus Peat and started his first contest at the position on Sunday at Tennessee.

T Landon Young - A mainstay at left tackle for his entire college career at Kentucky, Young played in 49 contests with 30 starts in his college career. The Lexington, Ky. native was selected by New Orleans in the sixth round of the 2021 NFL Draft.

T/G James Hurst - An eight-year NFL veteran who was signed as a free agent from Baltimore in 2020, Hurst has 109 career appearances with 55 starts at three different positions on the inside and outside. His versatility came in handy in 2020, as he started two contests at left tackle and one at left guard and the Saints gained over 200 yards rushing each time. Hurst moved into the lineup for three games at left tackle in place of an injured Armstead and has now moved into left guard in place of an injured Peat, followed by kicking outside in substitute for an injured Armstead on Sunday at Tennessee.

T Jordan Mills - This former Louisiana Tech standout from Napoleonville has played in 90 career regular season games with 84 starts for Chicago, Buffalo and Arizona. In 2021 he has served a valuable role on the line as a top backup for Armstead and Ramczyk.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

DEFENSIVE DRAFTS

Over the last seven drafts from 2015-21, New Orleans has shown a commitment to defense, spending 18-of-32 picks on that side of the ball. With nine picks in 2015, the Saints picked six defensive players, the most taken since New Orleans chose nine in a 12-round selection meeting in 1990. Below is an overview of the defensive players selected by New Orleans from 2015-21 currently with the club:

CB Paulson Adebo, Stanford (D3-21) - Selected in the third round (76th overall) of the 2021 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Adebo finished his college career playing in 22 games with 21 starts and recording 97 tackles, 34 passes defended and eight interceptions, earning All-Pac-12 in 2018 and 2019. He started in the opener and became the first Saint to record an interception in his NFL debut since 2002. Adebo posted his second pick in Week 6 at Washington.

LB Zack Baun, Wisconsin (D3a-20) - Selected in the third round (74th overall) of the 2020 NFL Draft out of the Wisconsin, Baun finished his college career with 154 tackles, 15 sacks, two interceptions, one returned for a TD, six passes defended, three forced fumbles and a recovery. The Saints were attracted to his playmaking ability Baun has posted four special teams tackles in 2020 and four in 2021, adding 13 defensive stops and a return of a blocked field goal this season. **CONTINUED ON NEXT PAGE**

Cornerback Marshon Lattimore, Ohio State (D1a-17) -

The 11th overall selection in the 2017 NFL draft out of Ohio State and the first corner taken possesses all the traits of a lockdown defender. With his agile, fluid style, Lattimore has the ability to shut down the best wide receivers. In 2017, he finished with 53 stops, five picks, to lead NFL rookies and the Saints, tying a team rookie record, a club-best 18 passes defended, a forced fumble and a recovery. Lattimore was the first Saints corner selected to the Pro Bowl since 1995 and selected as *AP* Defensive Rookie of the Year. His five takeaways in 2018 led the team, adding two more picks in the NFC Divisional Playoff win. In 2020, he led the cornerbacks with 63 tackles, two interceptions and ten passes defended as he was selected to his third Pro Bowl. Prior to the start of the regular season, Lattimore was signed by the club to a five-term contract extension. He was named the Week Six NFC Defensive Player of the Week, recording a career-high six passes defenses at Washington, the league's highest total since 2017.

Defensive End Marcus Davenport, Texas-San Antonio (D1-18) -

Davenport joined the Saints with the 14th overall pick in the 2018 NFL Draft after showing potential and production as a pass rusher at Texas-San Antonio. In four seasons, Davenport posted 22 sacks, including 8.5 in 2017 when he captured Conference USA Defensive Player of the Year. Davenport's strength on the line is a valuable asset for the Saints front, posting six sacks in 13 games in 2019. Davenport is tied for the team lead with four sacks after tying a career-high with two quarterback takedowns on Sunday at Tennessee.

Defensive Tackle David Onyemata, Manitoba (D4-16) -

Possessing a unique combination of size and speed, this Nigeria native had an impressive rookie year after becoming the first player from the University of Manitoba to be drafted into the NFL. Despite being new to football, the 2016 fourth round draft pick became a critical member on the interior of the Saints defensive front in 2017, playing in all 16 games with six starts, making 40 tackles and two sacks. Overall in his career, he has played in 81 contests with 43 starts, posting 196 stops, 16 sacks, one interception, five passes defended, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery.

Linebacker Pete Werner, Ohio State (D2-21) - New Orleans selected this three-year starter from Ohio State to compete at the linebacker position. The Indianapolis, Ind. native finished his college career playing in 47 career games with 35 starts, recording 185 tackles (111 solo), 16 stops for loss, four sacks, 11 passes defended, four forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Werner helped power the

Buckeyes to the College Football Playoff championship game as a senior in 2020, when he was voted by Big Ten coaches as a first-team All-Conference selection and a Butkus Award semifinalist, posting 54 tackles, 2.5 stops for loss, one sack and two forced fumbles. Werner made his first career start in Week Three and on Oct. 3 vs. the New York Giants had ten tackles. Leading the team with 13 stops in Week 6 at the Washington Football Team, Werner became the first Saints rookie since 2015 to have back-to-back performances of double-digit stops. He ranks fourth on the club with 39 stops on the season.

Free Safety Marcus Williams, Utah (D2-17) - A three-year starter at the University of Utah, Williams was twice named All-Pac 12 and earned second-team All-American as a junior when he tied for second in the conference with five interceptions. The defender boasts a dangerous mix of speed, fluidity, and instinct that allows him to read offenses and make breaks on the football. His athleticism showed in his rookie season in as he made 70 tackles, four interceptions and six passes defended, adding ten more stops (seven solo) and another pick in the postseason. In 2019, he played in all 15 games with 14 starts, posting 52 tackles (35 solo), the team-high four picks, tied for eighth in the National Football League, 13 passes defended, a forced fumble and two coverage stops. In 2020, he had a club-best-tying three interceptions and has two picks in 2021, while ranking third with 41 tackles.

Defensive Back P.J. Williams, Florida State (D3b-15) -

Williams' career was initially limited by missing all but two games his first two seasons with a hamstring injury (2015) and a concussion (2016), but he's rebounded to miss only two games with injury since. An experienced starter from Florida State, who developed into one of the nation's top cover corners, in 2019, he made 41 stops, a sack, an interception, three passes defended and one special teams stop, serving as the team's nickel corner for the second straight season. In the Dec. 22, 2019 win at Tennessee, Williams further showed his versatility by making the switch to safety after Marcus Williams was forced to depart with a groin injury and then starting in Williams' place in the regular season finale at Carolina. In 2020, Williams posted 37 tackles, a club-best two defensive fumble recoveries,, one interception, two passes defended and three special teams stops in 15 games. Williams has a team-leading three picks, tied for fourth in the NFL in 2021 and has added seven tackles and four passes defense, playing in all seven games with one start. On Oct. 31 vs. Tampa Bay, Williams picked off Buccaneers QB Tom Brady for a 40-yard touchdown return.

The Saints produced their most impressive run-stopping effort in several seasons in 2018 and carried it over in 2019 and 2020. In seven straight games in 2018, they didn't surrender 100 rushing yards to an opponent for the first time since 2007 had a seven-game run in 2020. The Saints have not given up 100 yards rushing in their last four regular season contests. Below are the longest streaks in team history the defense has gone without surrendering 100 yards. Between 2017-20 they didn't allow a 100-yard rusher in a 55 straight games (regular season and postseason), the longest streak in NFL history. In holding Buccaneers TB Ronald Jones to nine yards on Nov. 8, New Orleans' efforts produced dominant results as his rushing total was the lowest for a leading rusher in a contest for an opponent during this streak. In Keeping San Francisco RB Jerrick McKinnon to 18 carries for 33 yards (1.8 avg.), New Orleans set the NFL record for the longest streak of keeping individual rushers under 100.

Blake Gillikin was signed by New Orleans following the 2020 NFL Draft after a college career at Penn State, where he finished tied for second on the Nittany Lions' career gross punting average charts (43.03). After spending his rookie season on Injured Reserve, Gillikin has a 42.2 net punting average after a breakout performance in Week 5, where he had three punts drop inside-the-three-yard line at the Washington Football Team, flipping the field position battle and becoming the first punter since at least 2000 to have three punts of 53-plus yards downed inside the three-yard line. In Sunday's win over Tampa Bay, Gillikin punted at a 48.0 net clip and had a career-best 63-yard punt, helping him earn October's NFC Special Teams Player of the Month.

New Orleans' coverage and block units are expected to be led in 2021 by linebackers **Zack Baun**, **Andrew Dowell** and **Kaden Elliss**, defensive end **Carl Granderson**, defensive back **J.T. Gray**, safety **Jeff Heath**, quarterback **Taysom Hill**, tight end **Juwan Johnson**, wide receiver **Ty Montgomery**, running back **Dwayne Washington** and cornerback **P.J. Williams**.

One of the club's two third round draft picks in 2020, Baun, a former University of Wisconsin standout, embraced work on the club's coverage units in 2020 with three stops. On Sept. 19 at Carolina, he made an adept play by returning a blocked field goal and ranked third on the team with five stops.

After spending the bulk of the 2019 and 2020 season on the Saints practice squad, Dowell recorded his first career blocked punt on September 26 at New England.

On October 25 at Seattle, Johnson filled in for some of the injured Taysom Hill's responsibilities on special teams and recorded his first career stop on coverage units in addition to contributing on offense.

A seventh round draft pick of New Orleans in 2019, Elliss' blue collar mentality fit in with the coverage units with four stops in 2020 and has two in 2021.

Signed as an undrafted free agent in 2019 out of Wyoming, the height of the 6-5 Granderson, helps in leverage in block units, shown when he blocked a 55-yard field goal attempt on Sept. 19 at Carolina. He recorded his first career coverage stop in the October 25 win at Seattle.

Gray led the team in 2019 with 17 stops, blocked a punt and recovered a fumble on a muffed punt as he was selected an *AP* second-team All-Pro. Gray, voted by his teammates as the Saints special teams captain, led the team with two stops in the season opener and leads the team with eight stops (seven solo) in 2021

Heath is a nine-year NFL veteran who signed with New Orleans during training camp after spending the first seven seasons of his NFL career in Dallas and 2020 in Las Vegas, posting 63 career coverage stops, including three in 2021.

Montgomery, a seven-year National Football League veteran, was originally a third round pick of the Packers in 2015 out of Stanford. He can play tailback and wideout and also possesses the ability to return kicks. In the season opener against Green Bay, Montgomery downed a punt at the Packers five-yard line and had his first career special teams stop. On Sept. 19 at Carolina, he followed it up with three coverage stops and is second on the team with six tackles.

Washington is a sixth-year NFL veteran who was originally a seventh round draft pick of the Detroit Lions in 2016. In addition to his value in providing dependable depth at the tailback, Washington has excelled on special teams for New Orleans. In his career, he has posted 12 coverage stops and one blocked punt recovery.

Williams, in his seventh season, has continued to add to his versatility the past two seasons, flipping between cornerback and free safety on multiple occasions as well as increasing his contributions to the coverage units, where he posted four regular season stops in 2020 and his first post-season coverage tackle in the NFC wild card playoff win over Chicago.

Harris has made an impact on New Orleans' return game since being picked up as an undrafted free agent in 2019. Harris was signed following the NFL Draft out of NCAA Division II Assumption, where he finished his college career as one of the most prolific returners in NCAA history. In the final game of his college career, he set the NCAA-All Division record for career combined return touchdowns (14).

In 2019, Harris brought back 36 punts for 338 yards (9.4 avg.), ranked first in the NFC and fourth in the National Football League in punt return average, ranked second among rookies, following a 53-yard runback for a touchdown in the first quarter of the Sept. 22 33-27 win at Seattle.

He also returned 24 kickoffs for 644 yards (26.8 avg.), second in the NFC and third in the NFL and has recorded one special teams stop. On offense Harris carried twice for 18 yards (9.0 avg.) and caught six passes for 24 yards.

Harris is the first player signed by New Orleans as an undrafted rookie following the draft to be selected to the Pro Bowl as a rookie.

In 2020, despite playing in only nine games due to injuries, Harris showed his abilities to make big plays, averaging 9.3 yards per punt return, 27.3 yards per kickoff return and catching 20 passes for 186 yards and one touchdown. He returned to the active roster from Injured Reserve for the wild card win over Chicago and led the team in receiving with seven receptions for 83 yards. The following week in the NFC Divisional Playoff vs. Tampa Bay, Harris returned a punt 54 yards.

In the September 12 season opener vs. Green Bay, in addition to handling return duties, Harris had two grabs for 72 yards, including catching a 55-yard bomb for a touchdown from Jameis Winston. On Sept. 19 at Carolina, Harris injected life into New Orleans' field position, returning five kickoffs for a career-high 156 yards (31.2 avg.) with a 39-yard runback. Currently, he is ranked first in the NFC and second in the National Football League in kickoff return average, first on the team in receiving yardage with 24 catches for a 407 yards (club-best 17.0 avg., fifth in the NFL) and two touchdowns.

QUARTERBACKS

TAYSOM HILL

Hill's brought unheralded versatility to the Saints offense and special teams. A constant participant on special teams from midseason in 2017 to midseason in 2020, as well as the backup signal-caller and as a runner and receiver, in 2018, Hill averaged 24.9 yards per return on 14 kickoff returns, had six coverage stops, second on the team, completed a ten-yard pass on a fake punt and blocked a punt. Overall, Hill carried 37 times for 196 yards (5.3 avg.), third on the team, with two touchdowns and completed three of seven passes for 64 yards. The blocked punt that sparked a division-clinching win at Tampa Bay, earning him Week 14 NFC Special Teams Player of the Week. In the postseason, he caught a touchdown, made a special teams tackle and executed a successful fake punt, making significant contributions in all facets as the team advanced to the NFC Championship game for the third time in franchise history.

In 2019, Hill carried 27 times for 156 yards (5.8 avg.) with a touchdown, catching 19 passes for 234 yards with six TDs, deflecting a punt and posting two coverage stops. He ranked third on the club in touchdowns and third in receiving TDs. After a multi-threat performance Thanksgiving night at Atlanta, when he deflected a punt and caught and rushed for a touchdown. Hill became the first quarterback to rush for and catch a touchdown in the same contest since Jim McMahon (1983). In a valiant postseason effort vs. Minnesota, Hill led the team in rushing with four carries for 50 yards, caught two passes for 25 yards with a TD and completed a 50-yard pass.

In 2020, Hill contributed on multiple facets, completing 88-of-121 passes (72.7%) for 928 yards with a 98.8 rating, rushing 87 times for 457 (5.3 avg.) yards with eight touchdowns, catching eight passes for 98 yards with a TD and playing on special teams units until Brees' rib injury. Following Brees' injury, November 15, Hill went 3-1 in four starts.

In the 2021 season-opening win, Hill contributed to a 38-3 victory over Green Bay, completing a pass for three yards, rushing twice, including gaining a first down once and playing on special teams. Sept. 19 at Carolina, Hill started at tight end and rushed twice for 16 yards and added one coverage stop. In the September 26 win at New England, Hill carried six times for 32 yards, while his fourth quarter four-yard touchdown run helped seal the win. Oct. 3 vs. the New York Giants, Hill scored two rushing touchdowns for the third time in his career. Overall, he's completed seven of eight passes for 56 yards, carried 20 times for 104 yards (5.2 avg.) with three touchdowns, tied for first on the club, caught four passes for 52 yards and also added one special teams stop.

A DAY FOR FIRSTS

In Brees' absence in 2020, Hill received his first career start on November 22, 2020 vs. Atlanta and completed 18-of-23 passes for 233 yards, while carrying ten times for 51 yard with two touchdowns and a 108.9 passer rating in leading New Orleans to a 24-9 win over the Falcons.

Hill joined Daunte Culpepper as he second player in the Super Bowl era with 40+ rushing yards and 2+ rushing TDs in his first QB start. He became the first Saints signal-caller to rush for 50+ yards and 2+ TDs, since Archie Manning carried seven times for 52 yards and two scores in a 24-14 win over Dallas at Tulane stadium on Oct. 17, 1971.

VERSATILE VICTOR

Hill followed Head Coach Sean Payton and his coaching staff's game plan in a 31-3 victory over Denver on Nov. 29, 2020 that called for more of a ground-based effort. Completing nine of 16 passes, he also was a key part of a ground game that gained a season-high 229 yards, carrying ten times for 44 yards with two touchdowns of his own on the ground for the second consecutive week himself.

In the December 6, 2020, a 21-16 win at Atlanta to punch New Orleans' playoff ticket for the fourth straight season, Hill was a threat both with his arm and legs, completing 27-of-37 passes for 232 yards, his first two career touchdown passes and a 107.0 passer rating. In the run game, Hill carried 15 times for a career-high 83 yards (5.9 avg.), including a career-long 43-yard rush. Hill became the first Saints signal-caller to win his first three career starts at the position, joining Brees as the second Saint to win his first three starts in Black and Gold.

ON THE RUN

Hill enjoyed the most prolific rushing season for a Saints signal-caller in 2020, helping them maintain high seeding status in the NFC postseason race in Brees' absence with his arm, legs and leadership. Hill's 457 rushing yards ranked first all-time in club record books for Saints quarterbacks in a single season, while his rushing touchdown total is first. Hill finished the fifth among NFL signal-callers in rushing yardage, tied for third in rushing touchdowns.

- Siemian brings addition starting experience to the Saints quarterback room. Originally a seventh round draft pick in the 2015 NFL Draft by the Denver Broncos out of Northwester, Siemian has played in 30 career games with 27 starts, completing 558-of-945 passes for 6,395 yards with 35 touchdowns and 24 interceptions.
- On October 31 vs. Tampa Bay, Siemian entered the game in relief of an injured Jameis Winston and helped lead the Saints to victory, completing 16-of-29 passes 159 yards and a one-yard scoring throw to FB Alex Armah.
- On November 7 vs. Atlanta, Siemian received his first start as a Saint and completed 25-of-41 passes for 249 yards with two touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 94.5 passer rating. In the fourth quarter, Siemian helped lead the offense to score 19 points and take a brief 25-24 lead, completing 12-of-17 passes (70.6 %) for 110 yards with two touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 127.1 passer rating.
- On Sunday at Tennessee, Siemian completed 19-of-34 passes for 298 yards, the highest individual passing total by a Saint this season, with two touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 104.8 passer rating. In the fourth quarter, he led the New Orleans offense to nine points on their final two drives, completing six-of-ten throws for 119 yards with one touchdown, zero interceptions and a 135.0 rating.

- Book was the team's fourth round pick out of Notre Dame, where he was the Fighting Irish's winningest quarterback of all time (30 victories). In four seasons in South Bend, Book played in 45 games and completed 728-of-1,141 attempts for 8,949 yards, 72 touchdowns and 20 interceptions, carrying 360 times for 1,518 yards and 17 TDs.

- A talented runner and receiver with a 5-10, 215-pound frame who was selected by the Saints in the third round of the 2017 NFL Draft out of Tennessee, Kamara enjoyed an outstanding rookie campaign. He ranked first on the club and sixth in the NFL in yards from scrimmage (1,554), second on the team in rushing and receiving, carrying 120 times for 728 yards (6.1 avg.) with eight TDs and a two-point conversion, catching 81 passes for 826 yards (10.2 avg.) with five TDs and a kickoff return for a TD for a club rookie record 14 total scores, tied for second in the NFL. Kamara finished first in the NFL in yards per carry.
- Kamara was the first Saints offensive rookie selected to the Pro Bowl since Rueben Mayes (1986), as an AP second team All-Pro (flex), the clubs' first rookie All-Pro since 1993. He was named *The Sporting News* NFL Rookie of the Year and AP NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year.

- In 2020, Kamara even exceeded expectations as one of the NFL's most electric players in the NFL. He carried 187 times for a career-high 932 yards (5.0 avg.) with 16 touchdowns, tied for first in the NFL. He led running backs in receiving with a career-high and team best 83 receptions for 756 yards (9.1 avg.) with five TDs. Kamara, who was the second Saint to lead the team in rushing and receiving, led the NFL with a team-record 21 total touchdowns, was second with 93 first downs and third with a career-best 1,688 yards from scrimmage, the seventh-highest total in club history.

• Kamara enjoyed a productive start to the season in the season-opening win over Green Bay, when he started and finished with 83 rushing yards on 20 attempts. He now stands at 3,423 career rushing yards, surpassing Chuck Muncie and Rueben Mayes for sixth place in the Saints' record books. Kamara added eight receiving yards on three receptions, with one receiving touchdown, surpassing Pierre Thomas for the seventh-most receptions in club record books and the most receptions all-time for a Saints running back.

In the Saints' 2020 Christmas Day 52-33 win over the Vikings, Kamara tied the NFL record for total touchdowns and rushing touchdowns, as he carried 22 times for a career-high 155 yards (7.0 avg.), adding three receptions for 17 yards for 172 total yards from scrimmage. MARK INGRAM II

• One of the club's two first round draft picks in 2011, the 2009 Heisman Trophy winner has an integral part of the rushing attack since his arrival in New Orleans as the 28th overall pick. In 11 NFL seasons, Ingram has played in 142 games with 96 starts, carrying 1,716 times for 7,735 yards (4.5 avg.) with 64 touchdowns, also catching 278 passes for 2,026 yards with ten touchdowns for 9,761 total yards from scrimmage. That productivity has carried over to two playoff wins over Philadelphia, where he has carried 27 times for 150 yards (5.6 avg.) with one touchdown, adding five receptions for 26 yards.

WIDE RECEIVERS

MARQUEZ CALLAWAY

•After a productive college career on offense and special teams at Tennessee, Callaway joined the Black and Gold as an undrafted free agent in 2020. Appearing in 11 games with three starts, Callaway posted 21 receptions for 213 yards and also made an impact as a gunner and punt returner. He returned 11 punts for 122 yards (11.1 avg.), four kickoff returns for 94 yards (23.5 avg.) and recovered two punts on special teams. In 2021, Callaway looks to build off an impressive all-around rookie campaign.

Q FACTOR

In the September 26 win at New England, Callaway had four reception for 48 yards and scored his first career NFL touchdown from Jameis Winston.

The Tennessee product product then made a couple of big catches on October 3 vs. the New York Giants, catching two receptions for 74 yards, including a 58-yard grab in the second half.

Q FACTOR

In the Week Five win at the Washington Football Team, Callaway posted four receptions for 85 yards with a career-high two touchdowns, including a perfectly anticipated 49-yard "Hail Mary" scoring reception from Winston at the end of the first half.

Although Callaway had only three receptions for 32 yards in the October 25 win at Seattle, he saved his best for last with a fourth quarter 13-yard reception that advanced New Orleans to the Seahawks six-yard line and set up a 33-yard field goal.

Callaway's two receptions for 37 yards came at a crucial time in Sunday's contest at Tennessee, as he caught a grab for a 22-yard gain on the first play of New Orleans' final drive and then caught a 15-yard touchdown on third-and-13 on the drive to put the Saints within two.

As the only Saints wideout to play in all nine games, Callaway has 24 receptions for 346 yards (14.4 avg.) and leads the team with five touchdown receptions, tied for 12th in the NFL.

TRE'QUAN SMITH

- A talented fourth-year wideout, who was selected by New Orleans in the third round of the 2018 draft out of Central Florida, the 6-1, 210-pounder emerged as one of the Knights' top weapons from 2015-17 and was a key figure in their emergence. During that period, he caught 168 passes for 2,748 yards (16.4 avg.) with 22 touchdowns. In his final campaign for the 13-0 Knights in 2017, Smith appeared in and started all 13 games and hauled in 54 receptions for 1,082 yards (19.9 avg.) and 13 touchdowns.

- Smith recorded five touchdowns apiece in each of his first two seasons and achieved more consistency in 2020, when he posted a career-high 34 receptions for 448 yards (13.2 avg.) with four TDs to rank fourth on the Black and Gold in receiving. He was activated off Injured Reserve for the NFC Divisional Playoff vs. Tampa Bay, where he recorded three receptions for 85 yards (28.3 avg.) with scoring grabs from Drew Brees and Jameis Winston.

- Activated off Injured Reserve on October 25, Smith has 11 receptions for 141 yards with two touchdowns and is heating up after recording four grabs for 44 yards and a second quarter 11-yard scoring grab on Sunday at Tennessee.

16 of wide receiver Tre'Quan Smith's 96 career catches (regular season and postseason combined) have gone for touchdowns, reaching the end zone for 5.3% of his grabs, making Smith one of the team's most potent scoring threats.

TIGHT ENDS

ADAM TRAUTMAN

- The Saints were pleased to find the 6-5, 253-pound Trautman available near the end of the third round of the 2020 NFL Draft and made an aggressive trade up to the 105th pick to add him out of the University of Dayton. A converted high school quarterback, the Michigan native moved to tight end as a freshman developed into one of the top offensive player in NCAA FCS football, where he played in 44 games, recording 178 receptions for 2,295 yards (12.9 avg.) and 31 touchdowns. Though 16 regular season contests, Trautman posted 15 receptions for 171 yards with one touchdown while also impressively developing his blocking ability. In his 2021 debut against Green Bay, Trautman caught three balls for 18 yards. In the Week Five win at the Washington Football Team, he added two grabs for 43 yards, including a fourth quarter 32-yard grab. For the season, he leads the tight ends group with 20 catches for 183 yards.

DEFENSIVE LINE

CAMERON JORDAN

- New Orleans' first choice in the 2011 NFL Draft (24th overall) out of the University of California, Jordan enjoyed another standout season in 2019, posting 53 tackles (37 solo) with a career-high 15.5 sacks, to rank third in the NFL in takedowns, three passes defended and one fumble recovery as he was selected to his fifth Pro Bowl and a second-team AP All-Pro selection. With 96.5 sacks in ten seasons, Jordan's second on the Saints career sack list. He's also proven to be one of the NFL's best run defenders, playing an important role in top five rush defenses in each of the past three seasons.

Jordan is ranked second on the club's all-time sack list, tied for 39th in NFL record books.

CARL GRANDERSON

•Signed by New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Wyoming in 2019, Granderson posted 17.5 career sacks in college and possesses the perfect body type for a pass rusher. As a rookie, Granderson appeared in eight regular

season contests, posting ten tackles and one sack. In 2020, Granderson added 11 tackles, five sacks, ranked fourth on the team, a club-best two forced fumbles and one pass defended as he has seen more extensive time in the club's defensive line rotation as his game experience has continued to increase. On September 19 at Carolina, Granderson received his first start in place of an injured Marcus Davenport and blocked his first career field goal on special teams. In Week Five at the Washington Football Team, Granderson recorded his first takedown of 2021.

MALCOLM ROACH

•Signed as an undrafted free agent out of Texas in 2020, the Baton Rouge native has played in all four games with two starts in 2021, posting six tackles (two solo), one interception and one pass defense, helping hold down the interior for the NFL's top-ranked rush defense.

TANO KPASSAGNON

• Kpassagnon joined the Saints via unrestricted free agency in the offseason, looking to bring his size, speed and athleticism to one of the most productive lines in the NFL. Formerly a second round draft choice in the 2017 NFL Draft (59th overall) out of Villanova by Kansas City, Kpassagnon spent his first four seasons developing into a pass rushing presence along the Chiefs front. He started 15-of-16 games for Kansas City in 2020, recording 28 tackles (20 solo), a sack and three passes defended, starting all three postseason contests with five tackles (one solo), one sack and one pass defense in the Chiefs' run to Super Bowl LV. For his career, the fifth-year pro's played in 68 regular season games with 29 starts, recording 90 tackles (67 solo), 11 sacks, seven passes defended, a fumble recovery, two forced fumbles, a special teams stop and a blocked field goal. Kpassagnon has also started six-of-eight postseason contests for Kansas City, posting 12 tackles (nine solo), three sacks and two passes defended.

• In his Saints debut on September 12, Kpassagnon's sack/forced fumble recovered by Kaden Elliss at the New Orleans two-yard line in the fourth quarter against Green Bay, would keep the Packers out of the end zone for the season-opening win. He added a second sack in the team's win at New England, Sept. 26 to take the team lead for takedowns. Following a sack in the October 25 win at Seattle and he is tied for the team lead with four takedowns.

DAVID ONYEMATA

• A fourth round selection out of Manitoba in 2016, Onyemata teams with Shy Tuttle to form a solid duo in the interior of the Saints defensive line. In 79 games with 41 starts in five seasons, he has posted 184 career tackles, 16 sacks, five passes defended, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery. In 2019, he opened all 15 regular season games he played in, posting 32 stops, one pass defended and three sacks for the NFL's fourth-ranked run defense. Onyemata was re-signed to a three-year contract by the Saints in the 2020 offseason and is ranked third on the team with 6.5 quarterback takedowns, tied for sixth in the league among defensive tackles and one interception, starting every contest for a unit ranked fourth in the NFL in opponent net yards per game and fourth in run defense. In 2021, he anchors an interior that has helped the Saints defense currently be ranked first in the league in both run categories.

• This dependable and sure-tackling defender joined the Saints after a breakout 2017, where he started 16 games for the Jets. Davis posted a team-high and career-high 165 tackles (112 solo) and a career-best five sacks. For his career, the Brandon, Miss. native has appeared in 153 games with 139 starts for the Jets (2012-15, 2017), Cleveland (2016) and Saints, recording 1,065 tackles (707 solo), 29.5 sacks, two interceptions, 41 passes defended, three forced fumbles, six fumble recoveries and 24 special team stops.

• In 2018, Davis opened all 16 contests and led the team with 110 stops (74 solo), five sacks to lead the linebackers, four passes defended, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. Davis' abilities to diagnose and tackle played a key role in New Orleans ranking second in the NFL in opponent rushing yards per game and opponent rushing yards per play. ZACK BAUN

• An athletic, sideline to sideline linebacker, possessing the rare combination of pass rush skills and the ability to drop in coverage. After a stellar career at Wisconsin, Baun played in 15 rgames in 2020, with three starts at strongside linebacker, posting eight tackles (three solo) and four special teams stops. Overall in his college career, he played in 39 games with 27 starts, all which took place in his final two seasons, recording 154 tackles, 30.5 stops for loss, 15 sacks, two interceptions and three forced fumbles.

• Baun's strength and knowledge of the defense, which was on display when he led the team with five solo tackles in the season opening win vs. Green Bay.

KADEN ELLISS

• Kaden Elliss was selected by the Saints with their second of two seventh round draft choices (244th overall) in 2019 out of Idaho. Elliss is a strong, athletic player with coverage, pass rush and run-stopping abilities who bounced back after missing the majority of 2019 (knee). In 2020, he appeared in 15 regular season games and two postseason contests on special teams recording five stops. The son of former NFL standout Luther Elliss, he will look to play a bigger role in 2021 utilizing his strength, speed and size. In the opening win over Green Bay, Elliss's adept recovery in the fourth quarter at the New Orleans two-yard line would keep the Packers out of the end zone for the contest.

PETE WERNER

New Orleans selected this three-year starter from Ohio State to compete at the linebacker position in the second round of the 2021 NFL Draft. The Indianapolis, Ind. native finished his college career playing in 47 career games with 35 starts, recording 185 tackles (111 solo), 16 stops for loss, four sacks, 11 passes defended, four forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Werner helped power the Buckeyes to the College Football Playoff championship game as a senior in 2020, when he was voted by Big Ten coaches as a first-team All-Conference selection and a Butkus Award semifinalist, posting 54 tackles, 2.5 stops for loss, one sack and two forced fumbles. Werner made his second career start October 3 vs. the Giants and recorded a career-high ten tackles. With 13 stops in the Week Five win at Washington, the Indianapolis native became the first Saints rookie defender to reach double-digit totals in back-to-back games. He's fourth on the team with 39 stops and also picked up his first career coverage tackle on November 7 vs. Atlanta.

SECONDARY**MARSHON LATTIMORE**

• Selected by the New Orleans Saints in the first round (11th overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft, Lattimore started all 13 games he appeared in. He totaled 53 tackles (44 solo), a forced fumble, one fumble recovery, five interceptions for 85 yards and 18 passes defended, as he became the youngest Saint (21 years old) ever selected to the Pro Bowl and was selected as the *AP* NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year.

• In 2018, Lattimore opened all 16 contests and posted a career-high 59 tackles (49 solo), two interceptions, 12 passes defended, a club-best four forced fumbles, tied for fourth in the NFL and three fumble recoveries, returned for 91 yards, leading the team in takeaways and tied for the NFL lead in defensive fumble recoveries, the highest total among defensive backs. Lattimore also added two picks in

the NFC Divisional Playoff win over Philadelphia.

• A standout 2019 campaign by Lattimore resulted in him being voted to the Pro Bowl, the only Saints cornerback to ever be selected multiple times. Lattimore started all 14 games he played in and posted 57 stops, one interception and ranked first on the team with 14 passes defended.

• In 2020, he posted a career-high 62 tackles (52 solo), two interceptions and 11 passes defended as he was voted to the Pro Bowl for the third time. High expectations follow in 2021 as he signed a long-term contract extension to lock up the lockdown corner in the New Orleans secondary.

• After signing a contract extension at the start of the season, Lattimore's posted 33 stops, one pick and ten passes defended.

• After being selected in the second round of the 2017 NFL Draft (42nd overall) out of the Utah, this ball-hawking safety has started all 65 games he has appeared in, recording 258 tackles (193 solo), one sack, 15 interceptions, one returned for a touchdown, 33 passes defended, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. With a team-leading three interceptions in 2020, Williams' 15 picks since being drafted is tied for seventh in the NFL over that period, tied for third among safeties.

His five touchdown passes tied a career-high from when he threw five touchdowns against the Eagles (11/22/15) as a member of Tampa Bay. He also finished with 37 rushing yards on six attempts. Winston earned his first victory as the starting quarterback for the black and gold. In his first start with the Saints, Winston became the third player since 1950 to throw for five touchdowns in his first start with a team, finishing 14-of-20 for 148 yards and the five touchdowns. Winston's 148 passing yards is the fewest yards with five passing touchdowns since 1948. With zero interceptions, Winston becomes the first quarterback in NFL history to throw five touchdown passes with no interceptions in his first career start with a new team in a season-opener. Overall, Winston becomes the 7th quarterback with five touchdown passes and no interceptions in a season opener, and first since Baltimore QB Lamar Jackson did so at Miami on September 8, 2019. Winston became the 33rd player to start a game at quarterback for New Orleans, and the 11th to win in his first start. The victory is Winston's third career opening day victory and his first career win over Green Bay. **at Carolina (9/19):** Made his second start as a Saint, completing 11-of-22 passes for 111 yards and two interceptions. Winston got the Saints on the scoreboard with his first rushing touchdown of the season with 14:37 remaining in the fourth quarter. Winston eclipsed 20,000 career passing yards against the Panthers. **at New England (9/26):** Made his third start as a Saint, completing 13-of-21 passes for 128 yards and two scores. The win Sunday marks the 18th team Winston has defeated in his career as a starter. **vs. N.Y. Giants (10/3):** Winston completed 17-of-23 passes for 226 and one score on the afternoon, without having a chance to see the field in overtime. Winston's 58-yard completion to Marquez Callaway on the opening drive of the second half was his longest completion as a Saint, regular season or postseason. Winston completed 12 consecutive passes at one point in the contest to tie a career-high. This was Winston's first start in the Caesars Superdome as a Saint Sunday. **at Washington (10/10):** Made his fifth start as a Saint and also made his 75th career start Sunday, completing 15-of-30 passes for 279 yards and 4 scores with a 108.2 passer rating. Also had 6 rushes for 26 yards. Winston threw a career-long 72-yard touchdown pass to Deonte Harris in the first quarter, the longest of his career. Marquez Callaway also caught a 49-yard touchdown pass to end the first half; the last time the Saints had two scoring plays of 45 yards, or more was on December 18, 2016, at Arizona when WR Brandon Cooks had 45-yard and 65-yard touchdown receptions from Drew Brees. Winston is now 1-1 as a starter against Washington. The Saints win gives Winston at least a .500 record against 15 opponents. Washington becomes the 19th team Winston has defeated as a starter. **at Seattle (10/25):** Winston made his sixth start as a Saint on Monday, completing 19-of-35 passes for 222 yards and one score. He also rushed eight times for 40 yards, his season high and also his most rushing yards with the Saints. Winston led the Saints on their longest scoring drive of the season, which lasted 19 plays for a total of 86 yards and accounted for a total of 10:16. Jameis Winston now has a 2-1 record against Seattle, where he has completed 69-of-107 passes (64.5%) for 666 yards with five touchdowns, and one interception.
