THE MATCHUP

Following a convincing 44-19 victory over the Dallas Cowboys at AT&T Stadium, the New Orleans Saints (2-0) will seek to become the eighth Saints squad to win their first three games and retain at least a tie for first place in the NFC South, when they host the Philadelphia Eagles (1-1) on Sunday afternoon. The Saints accounted for 432 yards of total offense in a balanced performance as the defense recorded two interceptions which led to ten points. This output combined with a 47-point outburst in the season opener vs. Carolina have put the Saints in a tie for the second-highest point total (91) through a team's first two games since 1970, behind the 2009 Saints (93).

The Saints struck first on the opening drive as QB **Derek Carr** drove the offense down the field in seven plays and 80 yards, ending with a five-yard rushing touchdown by RB **Alvin Kamara**. Dallas booted a field goal, but New Orleans traded three for seven, when on the first play of their next drive, Carr connected with WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed** for a 70-yard touchdown, which gave them a 14-3 lead.

Leading 14-6 in the middle of the second quarter, New Orleans broke the game open when Carr tossed a screen pass to Kamara, which led to a career-long 57-yard touchdown to take a 21-6 lead. The Cowboys struck back when QB **Dak Prescott** connected with WR **CeeDee Lamb** for a 65-yard touchdown, but Kamara scored his third touchdown on the next drive, and after Saints CB **Paulson Adebo** picked off Prescott, the Saints scored their fifth touchdown of the first half on a Carr quarterback sneak.

The passing game was crisp, with Carr completing 11-of-16 passes for 243 yards with two touchdowns and a 125.0 passer rating and Rashid making four grabs for 96 yards, but the ground game and offensive line did the dirty work. Kamara carried 20 times for 115 yards (5.8 avg.) and reached the end zone three times.

The New Orleans run defense allowed only 68 yards on 21 carries (3.2 avg.), while Adebo and S **Tyrann Mathieu** each recorded interceptions. CB **Alontae Taylor** enjoyed a productive day as he recorded a team-best and career-high nine tackles. Up front, DE **Carl Granderson** finished with 1.5 sacks.

THE HEAD COACHES



Dennis Allen was hired as the 17th head coach in New Orleans Saints history on February 8, 2022. Now in his 29th year coaching and 23rd in the NFL, Allen has spent 14 seasons in New Orleans in two separate stints, including six-and-a-half campaigns (2015-21) as the team's defensive coordinator prior to being promoted to head coach.

During his 23 years of coaching in the NFL, Allen has worked with 13 players who have combined for 26 Pro Bowl selections and he has also coached two *Associated Press* NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year winners and three members of the Pro Football Hall of Fame.

Allen's defenses have consistently been among the most productive in the NFL in a number of categories, including scoring defense, total yards allowed and sacks. The team's defensive play-caller since the middle of the 2015 season, the Saints are the only team in the National Football League to rank in the top ten in opponent points per game each of the past four seasons.

In 2023, Allen guided the Saints to win four of their last five games as the team turned in a 9-8 performance, narrowly missing the playoffs. New Orleans finished 5-3 at home, winning their last three at the Caesars Superdome and captured their last three division contests, including convincing victories over Tampa Bay and Atlanta to close the season. New Orleans is off to a 2-0 start in 2024.

Prior to rejoining the Saints in 2015, Allen served as head coach of the Oakland Raiders from 2012-14 and as defensive coordinator of the Denver Broncos in 2011.

Allen played safety at Texas A&M from 1992-95, where he started the final 21 games of his career before being signed as an undrafted free agent by the Buffalo Bills in 1996. Prior to entering the National Football League coaching ranks in 2002, Allen served as a graduate assistant at his alma mater from 1996-99 and as a secondary coach at the University of Tulsa from 2000-01. He earned a bachelor of business administration degree and a master's in kinesiology from Texas A&M.

Raised in Hurst, Texas, Allen and his wife Alisson have a daughter, Layla and a son, Garrison.



Nick Sirianni was named head coach of the Philadelphia eagles on January 24, 2021, after having served as the Indianapolis Colts' offensive coordinator from 2018-21. As the Eagles head coach, the 17-year National Football League coaching veteran has posted a regular season 35-18 record, guiding Philadelphia to the playoffs in two of his first three seasons, including an appearance in Super Bowl LVII, where they lost narrowly to the Kansas City Chiefs, 38-35. Sirianni's .660 winning percentage is the highest by a head coach in franchise history and their only head coach to make the playoffs in each of their first three seasons.

Sirianni has guided Philadelphia to the fifth-best winning percentage in the league since he was hired during the 2021 offseason. During his tenure, 12 players have a combined 21 Pro Bowl nods, along with seven players collecting 12 *Associated Press* All-Pro honors.

Prior to joining the Colts, Sirianni spent five years (2013-17) as a member of the San Diego/Los Angeles Chargers coaching staff, including two seasons as wide receivers coach (2016-17), two seasons as quarterbacks coach (2014-15) and one season as an offensive quality control coach (2013). Sirianni broke into the NFL coaching ranks with the Chiefs (2009-12), serving as wide receivers coach (2013) and offensive quality control coach (2009-11).

Prior to starting his NFL coaching career, Sirianni served as defensive backs coach at his alma mater, Mount Union (2004-05) and as wide receivers coach at Indiana University of Pennsylvania (2006-08).

Sirianni was a three-year starter at wide receiver for Mount Union, winning three NCAA Division III national championships. He also played one year (2005) in the Atlantic Indoor Football League with the Canton Legends.

A native of Jamestown, New York, Sirianni's brother, Mike is currently the head coach at Washington & Jefferson College (Washington, Pa.) and his brother Jay, and father, Fran, are former head coaches at Southwestern Central High School in Jamestown, N.Y. He and his wife, Brett, have two sons, Jacob and Miles, and one daughter, Taylor.

SERIES HISTORY

The Saints and Eagles first met on Nov. 5, 1967, with New Orleans posting a 31-24 victory at Tulane Stadium. It was the first win in franchise history. In 1967 and 1969, New Orleans and Philadelphia were rivals in the NFL's Capitol division. The Eagles lead the regular season series 18-13, with the Saints holding a 3-1 edge in the playoffs. The Saints are 11-8 in regular season and postseason games played in New Orleans, the most recent a 20-14 2018 NFC Divisional Playoff Saints win.

LAST MEETING

January 1, 2023, Saints 20-Eagles 10: New Orleans won their third consecutive game on New Year's Day in Philadelphia, as the Saints defeated an opponent that finished with 13 or more regular season victories for the second consecutive season away from the Caesars Superdome.

While the yards gained by both teams was even at 313-313, New Orleans outrushed Philadelphia 129-67 and won the battle of time of possession 37:04-22:56.

Quarterback **Andy Dalton** was a model of efficiency, completing 18-of-22 passes [81.8 pct.] for 204 yards, including a 58-yard completion to rookie wideout **Rashid Shaheed**. Shaheed led New Orleans in receiving with six receptions for 79 yards. In the run game, running back **Alvin Kamara** had a game-high 16 carries for 74 yards. Tight end **Taysom Hill** affected all facets offensively, rushing for 46 yards and one touchdown, completing one of two passes for 24 yards and catching a pass for a nine-yard gain.

New Orleans surrendered 20 points or fewer for the seventh consecutive contest and also scored their first defensive touchdown of the season, as cornerback **Marshon Lattimore** returned to action and brought back an interception 12 yards into the end zone. The Saints tied a season-high with six sacks, three from defensive end **Cameron Jordan**, who became the franchise's all-time sack leader [115.5]. Linebacker **Demario Davis** led the team with seven tackles [three solo].

Special teams also played an important part in the field position battle. Five of **Blake Gillikin's** six punts landed inside-the-20-yard line to help the Saints win the field position battle, while kicker **Wil Lutz** booted both field goal attempts. Linebacker **Andrew Dowell** led the coverage units with two tackles.

LAST MEETING

The Saints will return to division play for the first of two consecutive road games, when they face the Atlanta Falcons on Sunday, September 29 at Mercedes-Benz Stadium. In 2023, the two clubs split the series, each winning their home matchup, the Saints defeating the Falcons 48-17 in the season finale to finish 9-8. The contest will have a noon kick-off and be regionally televised on FOX.

2024 GAME SUMMARIES

WEEK 1: Saints 47, Carolina Panthers 10; September 8, 2024 @ Caesars Superdome - The Saints, behind three **Derek Carr** touchdown passes, two rushing touchdowns and four **Blake Grupe** field goals, defeated the visiting Carolina Panthers, 47-10, at the Caesars Superdome.

The Saints jumped out to a 30-0 lead, scored on their first nine possessions [tying a club record for scores on consecutive possessions] and held the ball for 36:39 in time of possession en route to the highest scoring total and most lopsided opening day result in team history. New Orleans won their sixth consecutive season opener, a club record and the current longest opener winning streak in the NFL.

The New Orleans defense also displayed their mettle, allowing only 193 total net yards of offense by the Panthers and held the Panthers to just one of ten third downs.

The Saints defense recorded three takeaways and CB **Alontae Taylor** became the first Saints defensive back to record three sacks in a contest, but fans were excited by the debut of a new-look offense that helped the Saints control the clock with a rushing game that gained 180 yards and two touchdowns largely behind **Alvin Kamara's** 83 yards.

Carr completed 19-of-23 passes [82.6 pct.] for 200 yards with three touchdown passes, zero interceptions and a 142.5 passer rating. The New Orleans defense harassed Carolina QB **Bryce Young** all day, as he completed only 13-of-30 passes for 161 yards with two interceptions and a 32.8 passer rating.

- With the win, the Saints improved to 23-35 in season openers and extend their club-record winning streak of season openers to six straight, currently the longest streak in the NFL.
- WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed** led New Orleans with 73 receiving yards on three receptions [24.3 avg.] with one touchdown reception from 59 yards out, the longest play of the game. Including 60 punt return yards, sparked by a 47-yard runback and a 33-yard kickoff return, Shaheed finished with 163 all-purpose yards to start the season.



- Carr connected with two of his tight ends, **Juwan Johnson** and **Foster Moreau** for touchdowns.
- 17 players made their Saints debuts: T **Taliese Fuaga**, G **Lucas Patrick**, LB **Willie Gay Jr.**, DB **Will Harris**, QB **Jake Haener**, WR **Cedrick Wilson Jr.**, CB **Kool-Aid McKinstry**, WR **Bub Means**, CB **Rico Payton**, P **Matthew Hayball**, LB **Khaleke Hudson**, LB **Anfernee Orji**, OL **Oli Udoh**, WR **Mason Tipton**, DTs **Kendal Vickers** and **Khristian Boyd** and DE **Chase Young**.
- With 83 yards rushing and five receptions for 27 yards, Kamara's 110 total yards from scrimmage gave him his 50th career game of at least 100 yards from scrimmage.

2024 GAME SUMMARIES

WEEK 2: Saints 44, Dallas Cowboys 19; September 15, 2024 @ AT&T Stadium - The Saints posted an impressive road victory against Dallas behind the powerful offensive firepower of RB **Alvin Kamara**, the arm of QB **Derek Carr**, the hands of WRs **Chris Olave** and **Rashid Shaheed** and two interceptions by the defense.

The Saints struck first on the opening drive as Carr led the offense down the field on a sequence ending with **Kamara** rushing for a five-yard touchdown. At the conclusion of Dallas' first drive, K **Brandon Aubrey** booted a 52-yard field goal. New Orleans struck right back for their second score of the first quarter on a 70-yard pass play from Carr to Shaheed to put New Orleans up 14-3.

Leading 35-16 at halftime, the Cowboys got the ball out of the second half and New Orleans moved Dallas out of the red zone in the first drive, when DT **Bryan Bresee** sacked QB **Dak Prescott** and forced him to fumble before it was recovered by Dallas at the New Orleans 22-yard line, forcing a 40-yard field goal. On New Orleans' next 13-play, 70-yard drive, Kamara capped things off with a seven-yard touchdown, his fourth score of the day.

In the fourth quarter, Carr was intercepted on a tipped pass, but on the next play, New Orleans got the ball back on an interception by S **Tyrann Mathieu**, his second takeaway of the season. On the ensuing drive, New Orleans closed out the scoring in the contest with a 26-yard field goal by K **Blake Grupe**. Carr completed 11-of-16 passes for 243 yards with two touchdown throws and one interception, while scoring one rushing touchdown for a 125.0 passer rating. Kamara led the club in rushing with a game-high 115 yards on 20 carries with three touchdowns to go with two receptions for 65 yards, including a career-long 57-yard scoring grab on a screen pass. Shaheed led the Saints in receiving with four grabs for 96 yards with the deep touchdown, reaching the end zone in his third consecutive contest dating back to 2023.

The Saints defense harassed Prescott, sacking him three times and forcing two interceptions. CB **Alontae Taylor** led the team with a career-high nine tackles, while CB **Paulson Adebo** had his first interception of the season and DE **Carl Granderson** picked up 1.5 sacks.

- The win marks the first time the Saints have won in Dallas since a 34-31 overtime victory on December 23, 2012.
- Carr's two touchdown passes moved him into a tie for 26th all-time with Boomer Esiason. With his next scoring pass, he will move into a tie for 25th with Tony Romo.
- Shaheed's career-long 70-yard touchdown reception gives him eight career touchdowns on offense and special teams.
- Mathieu's interception was the 34th of his career since coming into the league in 2013, the most in the NFL over that time.
- A stingy Saints run defense held the Cowboys to 68 yards rushing on 21 carries (3.2 avg.).
- The 91 points by New Orleans in their first two games are tied for the second-most in NFL history through the first two games of a season, behind the Saints' 93 point total in 2009.

WEEK 2: LFG Player of the Game Award - RB Alvin Kamara

Awarded by FOX broadcaster Tom Brady to Kamara for his impact in the running game and passing game in New Orleans' 44-19 win at the Dallas Cowboys. Kamara carried 20 times for 115 yards (5.8 avg.) with three touchdowns and caught two passes for 65 yards, including a career-long 57-yard touchdown.

- LB **Demario Davis** will play in and start his 101st career game with the Saints Sunday, moving into a tie with TE Larry Hardy, WR Lance Moore and T Ryan Ramczyk for 58th on the club's all-time games played list.
- TE **Taysom Hill**, whose next regular season appearance will be his 100th, has 38 career touchdowns, 11th in club records. With one more touchdown, he would tie WR Lance Moore for tenth in and with two would take sole possession of tenth.
- Hill's 27 career rushing touchdowns are tied for seventh in club record books with RB Tony Galbreath. With one more rushing touchdown, he would move into a tie for fifth with RBs Chuck Muncie and Pierre Thomas and with two, he would move into sole possession of fifth.

- Kamara has 4,311 career receiving yards, ranked 21st in NFL record books among running backs. With ten receiving yards, he would surpass Christian McCaffrey and move into 20th and with 29, he would move into 19th and surpass Warrick Dunn.
- In Saints club records, Kamara's 4,311 career receiving yards rank eighth. With 67 receiving yards, he would move into seventh place past WR Devery Henderson.
- Kamara's 24 career receiving touchdowns are ranked 11th in club record books. With one touchdown grab, he would move into a tie for ninth with former Black and Gold WRs Quinn Early and Robert Meachem and with two, he would move into sole possession of ninth.
- Kamara's 24 career receiving touchdowns are tied for 19th all-time among NFL running backs with Clem Daniels and Ronnie Harmon. With one, he would move into a tie for 18th with James White and with two, he would move into a tie for 16th with Tim Brown and Larry Gannon.

A five-time Associated Press All-Pro (2009-13), Evans was selected first-team four times, twice as much as any other Saint. Evans was selected to six straight Pro Bowls (2009-14) and was named to the Pro Football Hall of Fame’s 2010’s All-Decade Team. During his 11-year tenure, the Saints were ranked first in the NFL in total offense (net yards per game) six times (2006, 2008-09, 2011, 2014 and 2016) and in scoring (points per game) twice (2008-09). The 274 sacks surrendered by the Saints offensive line from 2006-16 were the lowest total in the NFL over the period and the unit was recognized twice (2009 and 2011) as the winner of the Madden Pro- tector Offensive Line Award.

Evans closed out his playing career starting 14 games at right guard for the Green Bay Packers in 2017, finishing with 183 total games played/started. A Pro Football Hall of Fame semifinalist in 2023 and finalist in 2024, Evans began his coaching career as an offensive assistant for the Saints in 2023.

EVANS SELECTED TO SAINTS RING OF HONOR

Former Saints G Jahri Evans will be inducted into the club’s Ring of Honor during a halftime ceremony of the team’s contest against the Cleveland Browns on November 17.

Evans, 6-4, 318, was originally a fourth round draft pick (108th overall) of the Saints in 2006 out of Bloomsburg and developed into an anchor for one of the most dominant offenses in NFL history during his tenure with the Saints. The Philadelphia, Pa. native started all 169 regular season games he played in at right guard and all of the team’s ten postsea- son contests during that period, including all three during the 2009 campaign when the Saints cap- tured Super Bowl XLIV.

QB Derek Carr - Older brother, David was the No. 1 overall pick in the 2002 NFL Draft by the Houston Texans and played quarterback in the league for 11 seasons with Houston, Carolina, the New York Giants and San Francisco. Uncle, Lon Boyett, played tight end for Tampa Bay, the Raiders and San Francisco.

LB Demario Davis - Cousin of the late Steve McNair, the standout quarterback for the Tennessee Titans [1995-2005] and Baltimore Ravens [2006-07].

QB Taysom Hill - Brother-in-law, David Nixon, played linebacker and on special teams for the Oakland Raiders [2009], Houston Texans [2010] and St. Louis Rams [2010-11].

BUCKING THE ODDS

The Saints have a long tradition of finding players as free agents signed after the draft that make an impact immediately or after developing their careers initially on the practice squad. Several undrafted Saints on the roster play key roles on offense, defense and special teams, including four undrafted rookies who are on the 53-man roster out of the preseason.

Over the past 21 years, the Saints (2018-22: DB **J.T. Gray**, WR/RS **Deonte Harty** and WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed**) and San Diego/Los Angeles Chargers (2003: G **Kris Dielman**, TE **Antonio Gates** and WR **Kasim Osgood**) are the only two teams to have three players signed as undrafted free agents be selected to a Pro Bowl for the team that originally signed them.

In 2023, Shaheed was no longer a secret around the National Football League, as he appeared in 15 games with six starts and caught 46 passes for 719 yards (club-best 15.6 avg.) with five touchdown grabs to tie for the team lead, including seven receptions of 40-or-more yards, while also carrying seven times for 37 yards and ranking second in the NFC and third in the NFL in punt return average (13.6) and tenth in the league in all-purpose yards (1,479), despite missing two contests with a quad injury. Tying for the team lead with six total touchdowns including a punt return touchdown, Shaheed was selected as both Pro Bowl starter as a return specialist and as a first-team *Associated Press* All-Pro as a punt returner.

An integral part of both the team’s offense and return game, Shaheed and the Saints agreed to a contract extension prior to the start of training camp. Through the first two games, Shaheed has seven receptions for 169 yards (24.1 avg.) with touchdowns of 59- and 70 yards, carried three times for 13 yards, returned three punts for 60 yards and one kickoff for 33 yards. Rasheed’s 20.0 punt return average ranks third in the NFL, his 275 all-purpose yards rank third and his 24.1 yards per catch average rank fourth. Overall, since coming into the league in 2022, his 13 catches of 40 yards or more rank second in the NFL.

Originally signed as an undrafted free agent in 2018, spending part of his rookie season on the practice squad, Gray’s 71 special teams tackles since 2019 rank first in the National Football League, as he has been selected as both an *Associated Press* first-team All-Pro and Pro Bowler. In 2023, the special teams captain finished the season with 11 coverage stops to lead the team and tie for 12th in the league, despite missing three contests with injuries. In 2024, he is tied for first on the team with six stops.

TE **Juwan Johnson** first led Saints tight ends with four touchdown receptions in 2021, converting to the position that offseason after playing wideout in college and as a rookie in 2020, signed as an undrafted free agent from Oregon. In 2022, he led the Black and Gold tight ends in receiving with 42 grabs for 508 yards with a club-best and career-high seven touchdowns, tied for third at the position in the NFL. Johnson led the team’s tight ends with 37 grabs for 368 yards with four touchdown grabs in 2023. Johnson has led the Saints with 12 receiving touchdowns over the past three seasons, ranked fourth over that period among league tight ends.

DE **Carl Granderson** joined the club in 2019 as an undrafted free agent out of Wyoming and has appeared in 73 regular season games with 26 starts, posting 187 tackles (107 solo), 24.5 sacks for a loss of 159.5 yards, two passes defensed, three forced fumbles and two recoveries. In 2023, Granderson earned the starting right end position and posted a career-high 78 tackles (44 solo), led the team with a career-best 8.5 sacks for a loss of 55 yards, defensed one pass and forced a fumble and recovered one. Granderson’s 78 stops ranked fifth in the National Football League among defensive linemen and were the most by a Saints lineman since 2004.

After originally signed as an undrafted free agent out of Vanderbilt in 2023, where he led the Commodores in tackles in each of his final three seasons, LB **Anfernee Orji** received the opportunity to see extensive snaps in practice in training camp due to injuries to teammates Demario Davis and Pete Werner. He is tied for the team lead with Gray with six coverage stops and has also added one defensive tackle.

After originally signed as an undrafted free agent out of Utah in 2022, LB **Nephi Sewell** has become a valued member of the special teams units in his first two seasons, while also providing depth on defense. In his first full season in 2023 on the active roster, Sewell totaled five coverage stops and one forced fumble on special teams and ten defensive tackles. Sewell is currently on Reserve/Physically Unable to Perform, recovering from a knee injury suffered in Week 17 of the 2023 campaign.

Dallin Holker was signed by New Orleans after a standout graduate transfer campaign at Colorado State, where he posted 64 receptions for 767 yards with six touchdowns, the highest total of yardage and scoring grabs in the college regular season by an FBS tight end. Holker’s performance in the off-season and training camp secured a roster spot behind Johnson, Taysom Hill and Foster Moreau

New Orleans signed P **Matthew Hayball** out of Vanderbilt following the NFL Draft. The West Adelaide, Australia native finished as Vandy’s all-time leader in punting average (46.5) and was a consensus second-team All-American in 2023, when he ranked seventh nationally in net (43.1). Hayball won a training camp competition to secure the job. In the first two games, he has punted three times with a 40.7 gross/net punting average.

CB **Rico Payton** signed a college free agent contract in the spring, playing his final four years at Pittsburg State. As a senior in 2023, the St. Louis native recorded 35 tackles with four interceptions and 15 passes defensed. Payton secured a roster spot with his performance in training camp practices and preseason games, leading the team with five passes defensed and adding seven defensive tackles and one coverage stop in three contests. Payton has contributed on both defense and special teams in the first two games with one pass breakup.

WR **Mason Tipton** stuck on the training camp roster after showing bright spots in training camp practices, following a college career at Yale, where he posted 132 receptions for 1,067 yards with 19 TDs.

Playing in 83 career games, Gray has career totals of 73 special teams stops, a blocked punt, three fumble recoveries and ten defensive tackles, 2.5 sacks and a pass defense. In 2023, he finished with 11 coverage stops to lead the team and tie for 12th in the NFL in 14 contests. Gray's special teams impact was best on Dec. 21, 2023 at the L.A. Grupe was signed as a free agent out of Notre Dame, where he played his graduate campaign in 2022, after handling kicking duties at Arkansas State from 2017-21. In 17 games, Grupe made 30 of 37 field goal attempts and all 40 PAT attempts to lead the team with 130 points. In the Sept. 8 season-opening win over Carolina, Grupe had a career-high 17 points, drilling all four field goal attempts, including a first quarter 57-yard kick.

QUARTERBACKS

DEREK CARR



On March 6, 2023, the Saints agreed to terms with Derek Carr on a four-year contract to solidify the quarterback position. He spent the first nine seasons of his NFL career with the Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders. Originally selected in the second round [36th overall] of the 2014 NFL Draft by the Raiders out of Fresno State, the Bakersfield, Calif. native has started all 161 career regular season games he has played in, the most starts at the position over that time, completing 3,606-of-5,545 passes [65.0 pct.] for 39,543 yards with 247 touchdown passes, 108 interceptions and a 92.7 passer rating, while adding 899 rushing yards and seven touchdowns. Since entering the league in 2014, Carr ranks first in the NFL in completions, second in passing yardage and sixth in passing touchdowns. He became the third quarterback in NFL history to pass for 3,000-plus yards in each of his first ten seasons, joining Pro Football Hall of Fame signal-caller Peyton Manning and Russell Wilson. He is just the fourth player in NFL history to reach 35,000 passing yards in his first nine seasons and has completed 310 passes of 25+ yards since he entered the league in 2014, second-most in the NFL over that span.

Carr started all 17 games in 2023 and completed 375-of-548 passes [68.4 pct.] for 3,878 yards with 25 touchdowns, eight interceptions and a 97.7 passer rating. He finished his first season in Black and Gold ranked second in the NFL in fourth quarter passer rating [106.9], sixth in completion percentage, seventh in completions and tenth in TD passes and passer rating.

In 2024, Carr has completed 30-of-39 passes [76.9 pct.] for 443 yards, five touchdowns, only one interception and a 142.4 passer rating. Carr ranks first in the NFL in passer rating, yards per attempt [11.36], touchdown percentage [12.8], is tied for first in touchdown passes and ranked second in completion percentage, leading New Orleans to a 2-0 start.

RUNNING BACKS

ALVIN KAMARA

A talented runner and receiver, who was selected by the Saints in the third round of the 2017 NFL Draft out of the University of Tennessee, Kamara enjoyed an outstanding rookie campaign. He ranked first on the club and sixth in the NFL in yards from scrimmage (1,554), second on the team in rushing and receiving, carrying 120 times for 728 yards (6.1 avg) with eight TDs and a two-point conversion, catching 81 passes for 826 yards (10.2 avg) with five touchdowns and one kickoff return for a touchdown in the regular season finale. Kamara set a club rookie record with 14 total scores, tied for second in the NFL and finished first in the league in yards per carry.

Kamara was the first Saints offensive rookie selected to the Pro Bowl since Rueben Mayes (1986), as an *Associated Press* second team All-Pro (flex), the club's first rookie All-Pro since 1993. He was also named *The Sporting News* NFL Rookie of the Year and AP NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year.

Kamara is off to a spectacular start through the first two games of the 2024 season, carrying 35 times for 198 yards (5.7 avg.) with four touchdowns and catching seven passes for 92 yards (13.1 avg.) with a career-long 57-yard touchdown. With a nose for the end zone, he is ranked first in the NFL in total touchdowns, rushing touchdowns and total yards from scrimmage.

In the 2024 season-opening win over Carolina, Kamara led the team in rushing with 15 carries for 83 yards (5.5 avg.) with one touchdown and caught a club-best five passes for 27 yards, for 110 total yards from scrimmage, his 50th career contest reaching the century mark in the category. In Sunday's win at Dallas, Kamara had 180 total yards from scrimmage, including 115 rushing and four touchdowns, three on the ground.

In 103 career regular season games with 72 starts, Kamara has carried 1,350 times for 6,027 yards (4.5 avg.) with 58 touchdowns and has caught 512 passes for 4,311 yards (8.4 avg.) with 24 touchdowns. Kamara is the franchise's all-time leader in rushing touchdowns (58), total touchdowns (83), total yards from scrimmage (10,338) and all-purpose yardage (10,996).

SCRIMMAGE LEADER

Since entering the NFL in 2017, Kamara ranks third in the league in total yards from scrimmage (10,338), only one of four players to have 10,000 over that period. Kamara (2017-22) became the first NFL Player since Julio Jones (2014-19) to have six consecutive seasons of at least 1,300 total yards from scrimmage. The 10,338 total yards from scrimmage ranks tenth among active players.

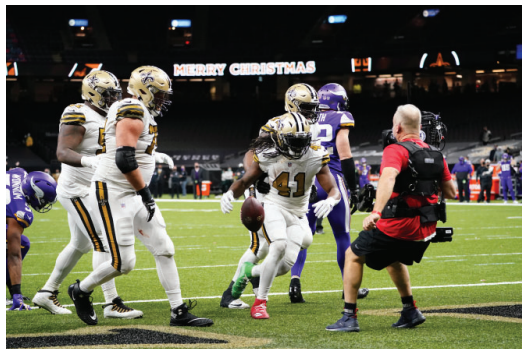

In the Saints' 2020 Christmas 52-33 win over the Vikings, Kamara tied the National Football League record for total touchdowns (6) and rushing touchdowns (6), as he carried 22 times for a career-high 155 yards (7.0 avg.), adding three receptions for 17 yards for 172 yards from scrimmage. The rushing touchdowns record tied the mark held by Ernie Nevers of the Chicago Cardinals since Nov. 28, 1929, while for total touchdowns, Kamara joins Nevers, Cleveland's Dub Jones (Nov. 25, 1951) and Chicago's Gayle Sayers (Dec. 12, 1965). The performance catapulted Kamara to the NFL's touchdown lead, as he joined running back Dalton Hilliard as only the second Saint to lead the league in touchdowns.

THIRD THROUGH FIVE

After Kamara's two-touchdown performance in the Week Five win over Washington, Kamara's 19 career games with at least two touchdowns are tied with four players for the third-most such games by a player in his first five seasons in NFL history. Only Pro Football Hall of Famers LaDainian Tomlinson (21) and Emmitt Smith (20) have more.

TEN OF ONE OF EACH

With the one rushing TD, two receiving TD performance in an Oct. 30, 2022 victory over Las Vegas, Kamara along with Christian McCaffrey on the same day became the first two players in NFL history to have at least ten games with at least one rushing touchdown and one receiving TD in their first six seasons. Kamara in his first game returning from a knee injury in the December 12, 2021 30-9 win at the New York Jets rushed 27 times for 120 yards with one touchdown and caught 4 passes for 25 yards. Kamara's touchdown run in the second quarter was the 67th score of his career and tied him for the second-most touchdowns in a player's first 70 games since the league merger behind LaDanian Tomlinson's 68 touchdowns in only 67 career contests.

TWO-POINT LEADER

With a pair of two-point conversions on Nov. 12, 2023, at Minnesota, Kamara is now tied for first in NFL record books with Pro Football Hall of Fame RB and New Orleans native Marshall Faulk with seven total, needing one more to become the NFL's all-time record holder. JAMAAL WILLIAMS

This seven-year NFL veteran was signed by the New Orleans Saints as an unrestricted free agent in the 2023 offseason. In eight NFL seasons with Green Bay [2017-20], Detroit [2021-22] and New Orleans [2023-], Williams has played in 105 games with 44 starts, carrying 1,040 times for 4,035 yards with 32 touchdowns, also catching 179 passes for 1,266 yards with eight touchdowns for 5,301 total yards from scrimmage. Williams is part of a formidable rushing trio with Kamara and his former college teammate, Taysom Hill.

JORDAN MIMS

A former standout at Fresno State, where he rushed for 3,285 yards and 37 TDs, Mims joined the Saints practice squad after going to training camp with Buffalo and contributed on special teams in two games for the Black and Gold in 2023. 6-0, 205, Mims will contribute in the run game and on special teams after earning a roster spot.

OLAVE WIDE RECEIVERS

The 11th overall pick in the 2022 NFL Draft out of Ohio State, this talented wideout made an immediate impact as a rookie, catching 72 passes for 1,042 yards [14.5 avg.] and four TDs, leading the team in receptions, receiving average and receiving yards, while earning September NFL Offensive Rookie of the Month honors as the 24th player since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger to record 1,000 receiving yards as a rookie. Olave became the third Saints rookie to reach 1,000 receiving yards and the first Saints rookie since WR Danny Abramowicz [1967] to lead the team in receiving, receiving yardage and yards per catch in his first campaign.

In 2023, Olave took the next step in his career, leading the team in receiving and receiving yardage for the second consecutive season with 87 receptions for 1,123 yards and five touchdowns, tying for the team lead. The Southern California native became the seventh Saint with 85 receptions in a season and the sixth Saints with 1,100 receiving yards in a single season. His 87 grabs are the 11th highest single-season total in franchise history and the yardage total ranks 16th. He reached the 100-yard receiving mark in five contests.

BY THE NUMBERS

2 - With 72 receptions for 1,042 yards [14.5 avg.], Olave joined Danny Abramowicz [1967], as the second Saints rookie to lead the team in receiving, receiving yardage and yards per catch.

RASHID SHAHEED

This third-year wideout has made his mark for New Orleans in both the passing game and the return game, where he was selected to the Pro Bowl and voted as an AP All-Pro in 2023. In addition to the return duties in 2023, Shaheed enjoyed a breakout season on offense, when he recorded 46 receptions for 719 yards (15.6 avg.) with five touchdown grabs, finishing 12th in the NFL in yards per catch.

Enjoying a breakout campaign, Shaheed has recorded seven receptions for 169 yards (24.1 avg.) with two touchdowns, carried three times for 13 yards, brought back three punts for 60 yards (NFL-best 20.0 avg.) and returned a kickoff 33 yards.

A.T. PERRY

New Orleans selected this big-bodied, sure-handed target in the sixth round of the 2023 NFL Draft out of Wake Forest. At 6-5, 205, the South Florida native possesses the ability to make the tough catch in traffic. During his college career, Perry set numerous Wake Forest receiving records, including a program-best 28 touchdowns. In his last two seasons, he became the first player in Demon Deacons history to have multiple 1,000-yard receiving seasons and shattered the single-season touchdown grab mark with 15 in 2021.

Perry moved into the wide receiver rotation at mid-season and in the last eight contests of the 2023 season, recorded 12 grabs for 246 yards (20.5 avg.) with four touchdowns, including two scoring receptions in the season finale victory over Atlanta.

GEDRICK WILSON JR.

This seventh-year wideout was signed by New Orleans to a two-year contract at the start of free agency to compete for snaps on offense and to provide veteran leadership to the wideout room. In 69 regular season games, he has recorded 101 receptions for 1,269 yards with 11 touchdowns. In 2023, the Memphis native posted 22 catches for 296 yards with three touchdowns, adding three grabs for 37 yards in the postseason.

TIGHT ENDS

TAYSOM HILL

Hill has brought unheralded versatility to the Saints offense and special teams. A participant on special teams since midseason in 2017, as well as a signal-caller and as a runner and receiver, Hill has played in 99 regular season games with 43 starts at several positions. He has carried 406 times for 2,212 yards, the most by a Saint not to play running back, with 27 touchdowns, tied for seventh in club records. In the passing game, he has caught 78 passes for 758 yards with 11 touchdowns, completed 191-of-298 passes (64.1 pct.) for 2,348 yards with 11 touchdowns, returned 19 kickoffs for 447 yards, made 15 special teams tackles and blocked one punt.

In 2023, Hill ranked second on the team in rushing with 81 carries for 401 yards (5.0 avg.) with four touchdowns, caught a career-high 33 passes for 291 yards with two TDs, completed six-of-11 passes for 83 yards with one TD and a 109.3 passer rating, returned a kickoff 18 yards and had two special teams tackles.

RENAISSANCE MAN

Hill turned in an all-around standout performance in the November 5, 2023 win over the Chicago Bears, where he led the team in rushing, carrying 11 times for 52 yards (4.7 avg.), completed a three-yard touchdown pass to tight end Juwan Johnson and caught four passes for 13 yards with one touchdown.



BY THE NUMBERS

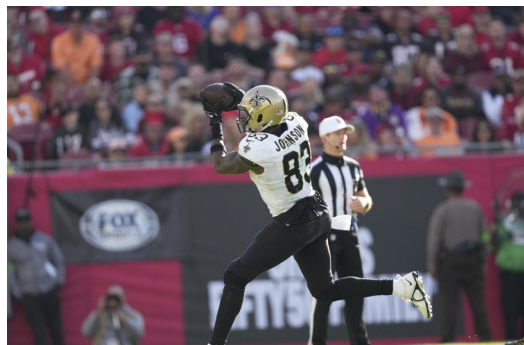
JUWAN JOHNSON

The former Penn State and Oregon wideout joined the New Orleans Saints in 2020 following the NFL Draft and transitioned to tight end his second season in 2021. In 2022, the New Jersey native had a breakout campaign as he appeared in 16 games with 12 starts and finished with 42 receptions for 508 yards and a team-best seven touchdown grabs. Johnson was tied for third among National Football League tight ends in receiving touchdowns. Overall, Johnson’s 15 touchdown grabs since 2021 lead the team.

In 13 games with 11 starts in 2023, Johnson finished with 37 receptions for 368 yards and four touchdowns to lead the position group in all major receiving categories. In his final four contests of the season, three of which were Saints victories, Johnson had 17 grabs for 206 yards and three touchdowns.

BIG TARGET

Johnson’s 12 touchdown grabs since 2022 are ranked fourth among NFL tight ends following his 16-yard scoring grab in the season opener.

FOSTER MOREAU

This veteran tight end and New Orleans native finished his fifth NFL season and first with the Black and Gold after spending his first four campaigns with the Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders. In his career, Moreau has appeared in 78 regular season games with 46 starts and has recorded 116 receptions for 1,343 yards [11.6 avg.] with 14 TDs, also adding seven special teams tackles.

After dealing with a nagging ankle injury in his first season in New Orleans, in the Sept. 8 season-opening victory over Carolina, Moreau led the team’s tight ends in receiving with four receptions for 43 yards with one touchdown.

OFFENSIVE LINE

ERIK McCOY

New Orleans traded up in the second round of the 2019 NFL Draft to select this standout from Texas A&M, who was a three-year starter, anchoring the middle of the Aggies line. In 2019, the East Texas native was the first Saint in franchise history to start at center in Week One, opening all 16 contests. McCoy has opened all 76 contests he has appeared in at center and signed a five-year contract extension with the team in 2022. Selected as a team captain for the first time in 2023, McCoy was the only Saints offensive lineman to open all 17 games and was named to his first Pro Bowl. The Saints will lean heavily on McCoy’s leadership in 2024 as the offensive line opened the season with three new starters.

GESAR RUIZ

The hard-working, talented and intelligent lineman embodies New Orleans’ culture. Ruiz was selected with the 24th overall pick in the 2020 NFL Draft out of Michigan. The three-year letterman played in 36 games in college, starting his last 31, including the final 26 at center. As a rookie, Ruiz settled in at right guard in the last 15 games with nine starts, as well as both postseason contests. When McCoy suffered a lower leg injury in the first quarter of the 2021 season-opening win over Green Bay, Ruiz transitioned over to center, where the Saints did not give up a sack in his four starts and was the only lineman in 2021 to start every game. In 2023, he rebounded from a lis franc injury in 2022 to open 16 contests at right guard.

DEFENSIVE LINE

CAMERON JORDAN

New Orleans' first choice in the 2011 NFL Draft [24th overall] out of the University of California, Jordan has played in 211 career regular season games with 210 starts, recording 778 tackles [480 solo], a franchise record 117.5 sacks for a loss of 779.5 yards, two interceptions, 64 pass breakups, 15 forced fumbles and 11 fumble recoveries. In 2023, despite a lingering ankle injury, Jordan started every contest and recorded 43 tackles [20 solo], two sacks, three pass breakups and one fumble recovery.

On Dec. 24, 2022, at Cleveland, Jordan played in his 200th career game [regular season/postseason combined] in a Black and Gold uniform, moving him into third place on the club's all-time games played list. The following week at Philadelphia, Jan. 1, 2023, Jordan also started his 200th career game, joining Drew Brees as only the second player to open 200 contests in franchise history. On Sept. 24, 2023, at Green Bay, Jordan played in his 206th career game, passing Thomas Morstead for second all-time in club record books. On Oct. 29, 2023, Jordan became only the second Saints player, first defensive Saint and 57th NFL defensive lineman to play in 200 regular season contests. On Nov. 5, vs. Chicago, he became only the second Saint to start 200 career regular season contests. Jordan has played in 210 career games, tied for 32nd all-time among defensive linemen with Elvin Bethea [Pro Football Hall of Fame Class of 2003]. On Sunday, he will play in his 211th career game and tie for 31st with DL Trace Armstrong.

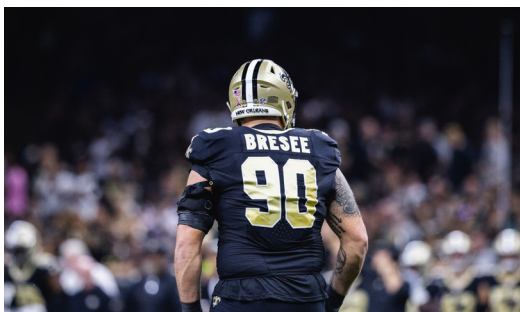

EAGLES VS. SAINTS

BRYAN BRESEE

The team's first round selection in the 2023 NFL Draft out of Clemson after being a three-time All-ACC selection, the Maryland native played in 26 games with 21 starts for the Tigers, producing 54 tackles [35 solo], 15 stops for loss, nine sacks, a forced fumble, an interception and five passes defended. Despite injuries and personal tragedy in 2022, Bresee fought through to manage 16 stops, 5.5 tackles for loss, 3.5 sacks and two pass breakups, earning second-team All-Conference.

Bresee immediately found a role in New Orleans' interior rotation and appeared in all 17 games, recording 24 tackles, 4.5 sacks and six pass breakups. His takedown total was the highest by a Saints rookie defensive tackle since becoming an official statistic in 1982 and his pass defense total was the most in club records for a rookie at the position since the statistic was officially recorded in 1980, Bresee also tied for second in the league among defensive tackles in 2023.

CARL GRANDERSON

Signed by New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Wyoming in 2019, Granderson posted 17.5 sacks in college and possesses the prototypical frame for an NFL pass rusher. Granderson has become a significant cog in the team's defensive line rotation with 187 tackles, 24.5 sacks, two pass breakups, three forced fumbles and two recoveries.

Earning the starting right defensive end position in 2023, Granderson posted a career-high 78 tackles [44 solo], led the team with a career-best 8.5 sacks for a 55-yard loss, one pass defense, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery. On Sept. 23, 2023, the franchise recognized Granderson's work ethic and commitment to both stopping the run and rushing the passer by agreeing to a four-year contract extension.

TACKLES UP FRONT

Granderson's 78 tackles in 2023 ranked fifth in the National Football League among defensive linemen and were the most by a Saints defensive lineman since 2004.

PAYTON TURNER

With the 28th overall pick in the 2021 NFL Draft out of Houston, the Saints added to the defensive line with this gifted pass rusher. In 15 career games, Turner has recorded 29 tackles, three sacks, one fumble recovery and one blocked field goal. In 2023, the Texan suffered a toe injury in the season-opening win over Tennessee that would sideline him for 15 contests. However, Turner returned for the season finale vs. Atlanta and recorded the first fumble recovery of his career, showing his promise both with his pass rush and playmaking abilities. Turner is part of the team's defensive line rotation and also contributes on special teams.

LINEBACKERS

CHASE YOUNG

Originally selected by Washington with the second overall pick in the 2020 NFL Draft out of Ohio State, this talented edge rusher is in his fifth season in the NFL and first with New Orleans. In five campaigns for Washington [2020-23], San Francisco [2023] and New Orleans [2024], Young has appeared in 44 regular season games with 32 starts and recorded 100 tackles [67 solo], 16.5 sacks, 20 stops for loss, nine pass breakups, six forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries. The consensus NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year, Young recorded 44 tackles, 7.5 sacks, ten stops for loss and made multiple splash plays with four forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries in 2020. Young played in only 12 games from 2021-22 after suffering a knee injury midway through his second campaign. In 2023, he played in seven games for Washington and nine for San Francisco following a midseason trade and tied his career-best with 7.5 takedowns in helping the 49ers advance to Super Bowl LVIII. Young has fit in with the New Orleans defensive line and his addition will be a boost to the front.

NATHAN SHEPHERD

Originally selected by the New York Jets in the third round of the 2018 NFL Draft out of Fort Hays State, this versatile defensive tackle enters his seventh NFL season, his second campaign with the Saints. The Ajax, Ontario, Canada native has appeared in 92 career games with 31 starts, totaling 172 tackles [90 solo] and nine sacks for a loss of 75 yards. In 2023, this valued free agent acquisition started all 17 games for New Orleans in the middle, posting career-highs in tackles [50], solo stops [26] and sacks [three].

KHALEN SAUNDERS

Originally selected by the Kansas City Chiefs in the third round of the 2019 NFL Draft out of Western Illinois, Saunders enters his sixth NFL season and second campaign with New Orleans. Signed as an unrestricted free agent in the 2023 offseason, Saunders combined with two other newcomers in Shepherd and Bresee to form a new interior front, recording career-highs in tackles [57] and solo stops [24]. In 55 career regular season games with 22 starts, Saunders has recorded 138 tackles [64 solo], 4.5 sacks, three pass breakups and four stops for loss.



DEMARIO DAVIS

This dependable and sure-tackling defender joined the New Orleans Saints in 2018 after spending his first six NFL seasons with the New York Jets and Cleveland Browns. In his career, the Brandon, Miss. native has appeared in 195 regular season games with 181 starts for the Jets [2012-15, 2017], Browns [2016] and the Saints [2018-], recording 1,339 stops [862 solo], 43.5 sacks, three interceptions, 55 pass breakups, four forced fumbles, eight fumble recoveries and 24 special teams tackles.

In 2023, Davis started every contest and again led the Black and Gold in tackles with 121 stops [74 solo], ranked second with 6.5 sacks and added one forced fumble, one fumble recovery and four pass breakups. He joined LB Joe Federspiel as only the second Saint to have 100 stops in six straight seasons, having done so in his last seven campaigns and his tenth season overall of his 12-year National Football League career.

PETE WERNER



New Orleans selected this three-year starter from Ohio State in the second round of the 2021 NFL Draft. The Indianapolis native finished his college career playing in 47 career games with 35 starts, recording 185 tackles [111 solo], 16 stops for loss, four sacks, 11 pass breakups, four forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Werner helped power the Buckeyes to the College Football Playoff championship game as a senior in 2020, when he was voted by the Big Ten coaches as a first-team All-Conference selection and a Butkus Award semi-finalist, posting 54 tackles, 2.5 stops for loss, one sack and two forced fumbles.

In three seasons, Werner has played in 45 games with 37 starts and has recorded 241 tackles [157 solo], a split sack, one interception, four pass breakups, two forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and three special teams stops.

Werner finished the 2023 season ranked second on the team with 93 stops, a split sack, one interception, one pass breakup and two fumble recoveries, tied for the team lead. In the second week of 2024 training camp, he agreed to terms with the Saints on a three-year contract extension.

WILLIE GAY JR.



A contributor on defense for the back-to-back Super Bowl Champion Kansas City Chiefs, this sideline to sideline linebacker joined the Saints at the start of the 2024 free agency period. In five seasons, Gay has played in 59 regular season games with 48 starts, posting 232 tackles [148 solo], five sacks, four interceptions, including one returned for a touchdown, 19 pass breakups, two forced fumbles, four fumble recoveries and seven special teams stops. In nine postseason games played/starts, Gay has accumulated 29 stops, a split sack and three passes defended.

In his final season in Kansas City, Gay played in 16 regular season games with 15 starts for the Chiefs and finished the season with 58 tackles [44 solo], one sack, one interception, four pass breakups, one forced fumble and a career-high three fumble recoveries. In three postseason starts en route to the Super Bowl Championship, Gay collected nine more stops and one pass defense.

ANFERNEE ORJI

After originally signed as an undrafted free agent out of Vanderbilt in 2023, where he led the Commodores in tackles in each of his final three seasons, Orji spent his entire rookie season on the club's practice squad. He received the opportunity to see extensive snaps in practice in training camp due to injuries to teammates Davis and Werner. In three preseason contests, Orji led the team with 20 tackles [team-high 13 solo], one stop for loss, two passes defended and three special teams stops, securing a 53-man roster spot. The Saints will look to utilize Orji's speed and physicality for contributions both on defense and the team's coverage units in 2024. He is tied for the team lead with six special teams tackle and has added one defensive stop.

SECONDARY

S TYRANN MATHIEU

This versatile, hard-hitting, playmaking safety and New Orleans native enters his third season with his hometown team, signing after the 2022 NFL Draft. Mathieu has brought experience and leadership to the Saints secondary. He was originally selected by the Arizona Cardinals in the third round (69th overall) in the 2013 NFL Draft out of LSU and has played for the Cardinals (2013-17), Houston Texans (2018), Kansas City Chiefs (2019-21) and Saints (2022-). In 11 NFL seasons, he has played in 165 regular season games with 156 starts and has posted career totals of 779 tackles (641 solo), 42 stops for loss, 11 sacks for a loss of 78 yards, 34 interceptions for 501 return yards, four brought back for touchdowns, 101 passes defensed, six forced fumbles, eight fumble recoveries and five special teams stops. Mathieu has been selected to three Pro Bowls, three Associated Press All-Pro teams and the Pro Football Hall of Fame's 2010's All-Decade Team.

In his second season in New Orleans in 2023, Mathieu opened all 17 contests for the second consecutive campaign and finished with 75 tackles (50 solo), four interceptions, tied for seventh in the NFL and the team lead, returned for 122 yards with a TD and nine passes defensed.

NOSE FOR THE BALL

Mathieu's 34 interceptions since coming into the NFL in 2013 are first in the league over the period after tying for the club lead with four picks in 2023. Mathieu's 34 career picks rank second among active players, behind Vikings S Harrison Smith's 35.

CB MARSHON LATTIMORE

Selected by the Saints in the first round (11th overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft Lattimore started all 13 games he appeared in. He totaled 53 tackles (44 solo), a forced fumble, one fumble recovery, five interceptions for 85 yards and 18 passes defensed. As a rookie, Lattimore became the youngest Saint (21 years old) ever selected to the Pro Bowl and was voted as the AP NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year.

In his eighth season, Lattimore has started all 91 regular season games he has appeared in, recording 377 tackles (306 solo), 15 interceptions, 86 passes defensed, five forced fumbles and five fumble recoveries, earning Pro Bowl honors in four seasons.

To open the 2023 season, Lattimore came up with a standout performance in the opening win over Tennessee. In addition to his 15th career pick, to move him into a tie for eighth place in club record books in interceptions, he also finished with four passes defensed, the third time in his career he has deflected at least four throws in a contest. In a season cut short by an ankle injury, he started the first ten games and posted 48 stops, one pick and eight passes defensed.

GET A HAND ON

Lattimore's 86 passes defensed since entering the NFL in 2017 are ranked first in the league.

CB PAULSON ADEBO

New Orleans' third round selection (76th overall) in the 2021 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Adebo overcame not playing college football in 2020 to make significant contributions to the Saints secondary in his first season with the club. The Texas native finished his college career playing in 22 games with 21 starts for Stanford and recording 97 tackles, 34 pass breakups and eight interceptions, earning All-Pac 12 honors in both 2018 and 2019.

Joining the starting lineup immediately as a rookie in 2021, Adebo has played in 47 games with 46 starts, posting 208 tackles, eighth interceptions, 36 pass breakups, two forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and two special teams stops.

Sharpened by an extensive training camp competition, Adebo enjoyed a breakout 2023 campaign. His season was highlighted by a two interception, three total takeaway performance in the Nov. 5, 24-17 win over Chicago that earned him NFC Defensive Player of the Week. Adebo finished with 76 tackles to lead the secondary, four interceptions, tied for first on the team with Mathieu, 18 pass breakups to rank third in the league, two forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries, also adding a pick on a two-point attempt in the Dec. 31, 23-13 win at Tampa Bay.

ALONTAE TAYLOR

Selected by the Saints in the second round (49th overall) of the 2022 NFL Draft out of Tennessee, Taylor shook off early injuries to play in 13 games with nine starts and posted 45 tackles (38 solo) and a club-best 11 pass breakups, ranked fourth among NFL rookies.

Moving to the nickel position in 2023, possessing extensive experience on the inside and the outside, Taylor appeared in all 17 games with 13 starts and recorded 75 tackles, his first two career interceptions in the last two weeks of the season and a career-high 14 pass breakups, tied for second on the team and ninth in the NFL.

DB DROP

In the Sept. 8 season-opening win over Carolina, Taylor became the first Saints defensive back to record three sacks in a contest since the statistic was officially recognized by the NFL in 1982. The only other defensive back to record three sacks on kickoff weekend is former Chargers S Rodney Harrison [vs. Buffalo, 9/6/98].

BREAKING UP

In 2022, Taylor was the first rookie since Lattimore to lead the Saints in pass breakups (11), and only the fourth in team history to do so (Saints did not track passes defended before 1980). He followed that up by finishing tied for second on the team with 14 in 2023.

NEW ORLEANS SAINTS

NEW ORLEANS SAINTS AT DALLAS COWBOYS SUNDAY, SEP. 15, 2024 • AT&T STADIUM SAINTS POSTGAME NOTES

- With the 44-19 victory over the Cowboys, the Saints move to 2-0 in consecutive seasons for only the second time in franchise history, joining the 2009 and 2010 teams. The Saints will return to action on next Sunday, when they host the Philadelphia Eagles on Sept. 22 at the Caesars Superdome. The game will be regionally televised on FOX (WVUE FOX 8 locally) with a noon kickoff.
- The win improves the Saints' all-time record against the Cowboys to 14-18 and their record at Dallas to 5-11. The victory breaks a 16-game regular season winning streak at AT&T Stadium by the Cowboys.
- The Saints outgained the Cowboys in total yardage 432 to 353, including a 190 to 68 advantage on the ground.
- The Saints have combined for 370 total rushing yards in their first two games, the third-most in a pair of games to open a season in franchise history.
- New Orleans scored touchdowns on their first six possessions for only the second time in franchise history, first doing so at Detroit on Dec. 21, 2008.
- New Orleans made the most of their opportunities on third down, finishing five-of-eight (62.5 pct.).
- The Saints scored 35 points in the first half, marking just the sixth time the club has scored five touchdowns in the first half of a contest in franchise history, last doing so at Carolina (12/29/19).
- The Saints also became just the third team in NFL history to score 30 plus points in the first half of each of their first two games to open a season, joining the 2001 Indianapolis Colts and the 1968 Oakland Raiders.
- With 44 points scored Sunday, it marked just the second time New Orleans has scored 40-plus points in back to back contests to open a season, joining the 2009 team. The 91 points scored in the first two games are the second-most points scored by an NFL team in the first two games of a season since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger behind the 2009 Saints (93).
- Head Coach **Dennis Allen** evened his overall record against Dallas to 1-1, improving to 1-0 against the Cowboys as Saints Head Coach.
- QB **Derek Carr** finished 11-of-16 (68.8 pct.) for 243 yards and two scores with a passer rating of 125.0. Carr also added a one yard rushing touchdown, his first as a Saint.

- Carr's first TD of the day came on a 70-yard pass to WR **Rashid Shaheed**, the longest completion by a Saint since QB Jameis Winston completed a 72-yard touchdown pass to WR/RS Deonte Harty on Oct. 10, 2021 at Washington.
- With two scores through the air Sunday, Carr now has 247 career touchdown passes, tied for 26th in NFL record books with Boomer Esiason.
- Carr improved his record as a starter against Dallas to 2-1.
- RB **Alvin Kamara** had a dominant afternoon for the Saints offense, rushing 20 times for 115 yards (5.8 avg) and three touchdowns to go along with two receptions for 65 yards and another score, including a career-long 57-yard touchdown reception on a screen pass from Carr. With his four touchdowns, Kamara became the only Saint to have multiple games with four or more touchdowns.
- Kamara now has 83 career touchdowns, tied for 62nd all-time with Joey Galloway, Anquan Boldin and Brandon Marshall and 58 career rushing touchdowns, tied for 57th in league history with Mike Alstott and Jamal Lewis.
- With two receptions on Sunday, Kamara now has 512 for his career and is tied for 14th among NFL running backs with Earnest Byner and Herschel Walker.
- Kamara now has 4,311 career receiving yards, tied for eighth all-time in club record books, surpassing WR Lance Moore.
- Kamara played in his 103rd career regular season game, moving into a tie 51st on the club's all-time list for games played with DT Elex Price and DB Malcolm Jenkins.
- Sunday marked the 12th time Kamara has had both a rushing and receiving score in a game, surpassing Hall of Famer Jim Brown and is now tied for third with Brian Westbrook and Lenny Moore for games with both a rushing and receiving score.
- With 115 yards on the ground against Dallas, Kamara now has nine 100-yard rushing games for the Black and Gold. He is just the third Saint to eclipse the 6,000 yard rushing mark, joining Deuce McAllister and Mark Ingram II.
- RB **Jamaal Williams** added eight carries for 39 yards. Sunday's performance put him over 4,000 rushing yards for his career (4,035).
- WR **Chris Olave** finished with four receptions for 81 yards (20.3 avg) including a 39-yard grab. He also added a seven-yard carry.
- WR **Rashid Shaheed** continued to be explosive, adding four grabs for 96 yards (24.0 avg) and a touchdown. His 70-yard touchdown in the first quarter was the longest of his career and was his eighth touchdown of 40-plus yards. Shaheed also added three carries for 13 yards for 109 total yards from scrimmage.
- CB **Alontae Taylor** led the Saints with a career-high and game-high nine tackles, including a career-best eight solo stops.

- LB **Demario Davis** totaled eight tackles (three solo) and a pass breakup. Sunday was Davis's 100th career game for New Orleans and his 100th consecutive start, moving into a tie with CB Johnnie Poe and C Jerry Fontenot for 62nd on the club's all-time games played list.
- LB **Pete Werner** also added eight stops (five solo) for the New Orleans defense.
- DE **Carl Granderson** was disruptive again for New Orleans, adding five stops, 1.5 sacks and a stop for loss.
- CB **Paulson Adebo** was huge for the Black and Gold defense, adding four tackles, two pass breakups and a second quarter interception returned for 47 yards to set up a Saints touchdown.
- Rookie CB **Kool Aid McKinstry** made his first NFL start in place of the injured CB **Marshon Lattimore** and finished with five stops (three solo) and a pass breakup.
- S **Tyrann Mathieu** added three tackles, two pass breakups and his 34th career interception. The 34 interceptions are the most in the NFL since 2013. Mathieu's two pass breakups also bring his career total to 101.
- DE **Chase Young** finished with four tackles, one quarterback hit, and a half sack, his first sack with the Black and Gold.
- DT **Bryan Bresee** finished with two tackles, one sack and one forced fumble.
- LS **Zach Wood** played in his 117th career game on Sunday, moving into a tie for 35th place on the club's all-time list for games played with former Saints TE and current Pro Scout Josh Hill.
