**THE MATCHUP**

Following a hard-fought 20-10 loss to the Tampa Bay Buccaneers at the Caesars Superdome on Sunday, the New Orleans Saints go on the road for two weeks, starting with finishing out the first half of their 2022 NFC South slate with a September 25 matchup against the Carolina Panthers at Bank of America Stadium. Kickoff is at 12 p.m. CT for a contest that will be regionally televised on FOX.

New Orleans will close out the first half its division slate against Carolina after splitting the season series against the Panthers in 2021 with each team claiming a victory at their home stadium. This will be the first of two matchups against Carolina with the Saints and Panthers closing their regular season in Week 18 at the Caesars Superdome.

The Saints enter Sunday's contest having won five of the last six games against the Panthers, sweeping the season series in 2019 and 2020 and splitting in 2021. New Orleans leads the all-time regular season series 28-26, capturing the only playoff meeting as well, taking charge of it since 2017 with an 8-2 regular season record and being victors in the 2017 NFC Wild Card Playoff.

New Orleans fell to 1-1 after dropping a hard-fought battle with the Buccaneers on Sunday after holding a 3-0 lead until midway through the third quarter, as K **Wil Lutz**

provided the game's only points for two and a half quarters on a 31-yard field on the first drive of the contest. Five Saints turnovers in the last 16:11 of the contest served as the turning point for the Buccaneers

QB **Jameis Winston** completed 25-of-40 passes for 236 yards, one touchdown to WR **Michael Thomas** and three interceptions. After missing the entire 2021 season due to an ankle injury, Thomas has posted 11 grabs for 122 yards and three touchdowns to tie for the NFL lead in scoring grabs through Week Two of the season. RB **Mark Ingram II** carried ten times for 60 yards and caught two passes as he reached 10,000 career total yards from scrimmage, but also lost a fumble in the red zone.

Defensively, New Orleans put on a gritty performance, limiting the Buccaneers offense to scoring only one offensive touchdown and two field goals. They held the Tampa Bay running game to just 2.4 yards per carry over 30 attempts. DT **Shy Tuttle** led the team with nine tackles, a split sack and a pass defended. Second-year LB **Pete Werner** finished second on the team with eight stops to increase his team-leading tackle total to 20 on the season.

**This Week In The NFC South:** The Atlanta Falcons will play at the Seattle Seahawks, while the Tampa Bay Buccaneers welcome in the Green Bay Packers on Sunday.

## **THE HEAD COACHES**

**Dennis Allen** was hired as the 17th head coach in New Orleans Saints history on February 8, 2022. Now in his 27th year coaching and 21st in the NFL, Allen has spent 12 seasons in New Orleans in two stints, including the last six-and-a-half campaigns as the team's defensive coordinator. He succeeds Sean Payton, who coached the team for 16 seasons, including the 2009 campaign, when Allen was secondary coach and ended with the Super Bowl XLIV championship. When Allen took control of a Black and Gold defense in Week 11 of the 2015 season that was ranked 32nd in opponent net yards per game and opponent points per game, he methodically molded a unit that has finished in the top 10 in both categories each of the last two years, effectively synchronizing with the team's offensive and special teams units to produce five consecutive winning seasons (2017-present) and four straight division titles and playoff berths (2017-20). From 2017 to the present, New Orleans is the only defense in the NFL to rank in the top five in the National Football League in both opponent rushing yards per game and sacks.

Before rejoining the Saints coaching staff in 2015, Allen served as head coach of the Oakland Raiders from 2012-14 and as defensive coordinator of the Denver Broncos in 2011. Prior to his first stint in New Orleans from 2006-10, Allen was also an assistant in Atlanta from 2002-05.

Allen played safety at Texas A&M from 1992-95, where he started the final 21 games of his career before being signed as an undrafted free agent by the Buffalo Bills in 1996. Prior to entering the National Football League coaching ranks in 2002, Allen served as a graduate assistant at his alma mater from 1996-99 and as secondary coach at the University of Tulsa from 2000-2001. He earned a bachelor of business administration degree and a master's in kinesiology from Texas A&M.

Raised in Hurst, Texas, Allen and his wife Alisson have a daughter, Layla and a son, Garrison.

**Matt Rhule** was named the fifth head coach in Panthers history on Jan. 8, 2020 and guided them to a 5-11 record in his first campaign, following up by 5-12 mark in 2021.

Rhule joined Carolina after three seasons (2017-19) as the head coach at Baylor. Rhule helped rebuild the Baylor program, guiding the team from a 1-11 finish in his first season to a 7-6 record and a bowl berth in 2018 to an 11-3 record and appearance in the Big 12 Championship and Sugar Bowl in 2019. He was voted the Big 12 Conference's Coach of the Year by his peers. Baylor's appearance in the Sugar Bowl was just the second-ever in school history, and under Rhule's leadership, the Bears became the first Power 5 program to go from 11 losses (2017) to 11 wins (2019) within two seasons. Prior to his stint at Bay-

lor, Rhule was the head coach at Temple (2013-16), where he took the Owls from a 2-10 mark in his first season to 6-6 in 2014 and two consecutive 10-in seasons in 2015 and 2016. He guided the Owls to the school's first back-to-back 10-win seasons, a two bowl berths (2015-16) and the 2016 AAC Championship. He helped the Owls improve from a two-win season in his first year in 2013. Rhule has spent 23 years as a coach in the college and NFL ranks. Rhule was an assistant offensive line coach with the New York Giants (2012) and a college assistant at Temple (2006-11), serving as offensive coordinator (2008-11), quarterbacks coach and recruiting coordinator (2007) and defensive line coach (2006). He also was part of the coaching staffs at Western Carolina (2002-05), UCLA (2001), Buffalo (1999-2000) and Albright College (1998).

Rhule played linebacker at Penn State from 1994-97.

Rhule and his wife Julie have three children, Bryant, Vivienne and Leona.

## NEW ORLEANS SAINTS-CAROLINA PANTHERS SERIES HISTORY

The Panthers initially entered the National Football League as an expansion franchise in 1995 and since then, with New Orleans leading the regular season series 28-26, with the Saints picking up the 2017 NFC Wild Card showdown at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome. The clubs were in the NFC West from 1995-2001 and the rivalry has continued in the NFC South since it was formed in 2002 divisional realignment. The Saints have a 14-12 record in games played in the Caesars Superdome against the Panthers. Of the 54 regular season games in the series, 26 have been decided by eight points or less, with New Orleans winning 14. The Saints' longest winning streak was a five-game stretch from 2000-02.

In the 54 regular season games of the series there has been:

- 1,200 points scored by New Orleans, 1,164 allowed.
- A five-game New Orleans winning streak from 2000-02.
- A four-game New Orleans winning streak in games played at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome from 1998-2001 and a four-game winning streak at contests played at Bank of America Stadium from 2017-20.
- 27 games decided by double-digits.
- Seven games decided by 21 or more points.
- 26 games decided by eight points or less.
- One 32-point win by New Orleans in the 2020 regular season finale.
- A 32-point loss by New Orleans.

## **LAST MEETING**

**Saints 18, Panthers 10; January 2, 2022 @ Caesars Superdome** – Cameron Jordan bolted into the backfield from the left edge of Carolina's offensive line. The Saints defensive end wrapped both arms around Sam Darnold, lifted the Panthers' quarterback off his feet and pulled him to the turf on his side as if they were on a wrestling mat. That was one of 3 1/2 sacks for Jordan, who led a menacing, seven-sack performance by New Orleans' defense in a crucial 18-10 Saints victory over the reeling Panthers on Sunday that kept the Saints in the hunt for a playoff spot. "It's a full-blown push from the entire D-line," Jordan said. "We're a force to be reckoned with. ... When we take over the game, there's not much anybody can do." The way Jordan and Co. were playing, the Saints might have won for the second time in three games without even scoring a touchdown. But after Brett Maher kicked four field goals to give them a 12-10 lead, Alvin Kamara capped the scoring by turning a short pass into New Orleans' first touchdown in more than 11 quarters.

The third victory in four games for the Saints (8-8) — also just their second triumph in seven games played in the Superdome this season — assured New Orleans would head into the final week of the regular season with a chance to cap an adversity-filled season with a postseason berth.

"When we hear people say must-win games, today was a must-win game," Saints coach Sean Payton said, crediting his players' sense of urgency. "These guys understood it." Taysom Hill completed 17 of 28 passes for 222 yards. He also led the Saints in rushing with 45 yards while playing behind an offensive line missing four season-opening starters. Marquez Callaway caught six passes for 97 yards and Kamara had five catches for 68 yards, including his 12-yard TD in the fourth quarter.

C.J. Gardner Johnson squelched Carolina's last chance to drive for a tying score with his interception in the final minute, dooming the Panthers (5-11) to a sixth straight loss. "Bottom line is just everyone's not playing good enough," Darnold said. "Everyone on offense — we're just not playing good enough to win games. I think that's as simple as it is."

Darnold regained his starting job this week after Cam Newton had started in Carolina's previous five losses. Darnold completed 17 of 26 passes for 132 yards — a significant drop-off from his winning outing against the Saints in Week 2.

"In the end their (defensive) front won the game for them; we weren't able to get them blocked," said Panthers coach Matt Rhule, who has come under increasing scrutiny as Carolina has lost 11 of 13 games. "It's the same story we've had when we haven't played well offensively. When Sam had protection, he was able to complete balls and had some nice throws."

Carolina did not trail in the first half, taking a 10-3 lead on Chuba Hubbard's slashing 21-yard run early in the second quarter.

After that, Gardner-Johnson said Saints defenders were resolved to "tackle better and run to the ball — play with passion."

They did not allow a point the rest of the way.

"Sometimes it's about X's and O's. Sometimes it's about passion," Gardner-Johnson said. "You got to be way more physical than the other team."

New Orleans looked primed to tie it when P.J. Williams dislodged the ball from Darnold on a sack and Marcus Davenport recovered, giving the Saints the ball at the Carolina 13. But New Orleans had to kick a field goal after three unfruitful plays.

With just more than a minute remaining in the half, the Saints faced a third-and-11 from their 3. Conventional wisdom would have been to run the ball and then punt because Carolina had no timeouts. Instead, Hill let fly a 28-yard back-shoulder throw that Callaway caught along the left sideline.

Hill then hit Lil'Jordan Humphrey for 18 yards and Callaway for another 15 before New Orleans used its last timeout. Hill completed one more quick pass to set up Maher's third field goal as the half ended to make it 10-9.

"We go from possibly having a punt backed up to putting the ball at midfield and then transitioning to a field goal," Payton said. "You start doing the math on how that half could have ended — I do think (that drive) was important." Most of the third quarter was played on Carolina's side of the 50, but the Saints had one promising drive stall on an intentional grounding penalty and the another ended with a field goal.

The Panthers missed a chance to retake the lead when Carolina kicker Lirim Hajrullahu's sailed a 47-yard field goal attempt wide right.

**GAME SUMMARIES**

**Week 1: Saints 27, Falcons 26; September 11, 2022 @ Mercedes-Benz Stadium** — A new coach. A bunch of guys coming back from injuries. A 16-point deficit in the fourth quarter.

None of it flustered the New Orleans Saints, who pulled off a stunning comeback Sunday.

Wil Lutz kicked a 51-yard field goal with 19 seconds remaining after Jameis Winston guided a pair of lightning-quick touchdown drives, giving the Saints a 27-26 victory over the Atlanta Falcons in Dennis Allen's coaching debut. "It was exciting," Winston said with a smile. "We've just got to find a way to get there quicker."

After struggling offensively through most of the season opener, the Saints finally found their rhythm.

Winston threw for 269 yards after going down last season on Halloween with a knee injury. Michael Thomas hauled in a pair of fourth-quarter TD passes in his first game since the 2020 season, having missed an entire campaign with complications from an ankle injury.

And Lutz delivered at the end, showing he's fully recovered from a core issue that kept him out for all of 2021.

"I'm happy with our resilience," Winston said. "We never gave up."

Winston hooked up with Thomas on touchdown passes of 3 and 9 yards. The Saints converted one 2-point try, but failed on the other, leaving the Falcons clinging to a 26-24 lead.

New Orleans got the ball back one more time, taking over at its own 20 with 48 seconds remaining and no timeouts. No problem.

Winston connected on a 40-yard pass to Jarvis Landry and a 17-yarder to Juwan Johnson to set up Lutz's winning field goal.

A personal foul on the Saints gave the Falcons a chance to pull out the victory, but Youngbue Koo's 63-yard field goal attempt was blocked as the clock ran out.

It was a stirring start to the Allen era.

Sean Payton, who coached the team for 15 years and led New Orleans to its lone Super Bowl title, surprisingly stepped down after last season.

His defensive coordinator got the job, even though Allen's first head coaching stint resulted in a record of 8-28 with the Raiders in 2012-14.

Make it 9-28.

"I hope they're not all like that," Allen said. "Look, our team is tough and gritty. That's what I love about 'em. That's exactly the way they played in this game. It wasn't perfect. We've got a ton of things to clean up."

The Falcons, who have seemingly never recovered from squandering a 28-3 lead in the 2017 Super Bowl, added another meltdown to their resume in their first game of the post-Matt Ryan era.

## GAME SUMMARIES

Cordarrelle Patterson rushed for a career-high 120 yards, including a 5-yard scoring burst, and Marcus Mariota made his first start since 2019 as Ryan's replacement.

Mariota threw for 215 yards and added 72 on the ground, highlight by a 2-yard touchdown run.

But in the end, the Falcons let what seemed like a sure victory get away.

"You guys wrote our obituary back in May and you'll continue to write our obituary," second-year coach Arthur Smith grumbled to reporters. "Who cares? We've got 16 games to learn from this and get better."

Winston was sacked four times by a team that had a league-low 18 sacks a year ago. He passed for just 24 yards in the first half, but made all the throws when it really counted.

Landry had seven catches for 114 yards, and Thomas finished with five catches for 57 yards.

"It was a blessing to be back out there with the guys," said Thomas, who had an NFL-record 149 receptions in 2019 but was playing just his eighth game since then.

#### SECOND CHANCE

Lutz was kicking himself after his first field goal attempt from 44 yards hit the left upright.

He bounced back to make a 49-yarder before connecting on the game-winner.

"Obviously, coming off a miss is tough," Lutz said. "But that's what we signed up to do. I'm grateful the defense gave me a chance to get back out there and the offense put me in position to make the kick. It feels really good."

#### PROMISING STARTS

Both teams got plenty of production from their first-round rookie receivers.

Drake London, the No. 8 overall selection, led the Falcons with five catches for 74 yards.

Chris Olave, the No. 11 choice by the Saints, had three receptions for 41 yards and hauled in another catch on New Orleans' successful 2-point conversion.

### Week 2: Buccaneers 20, Saints 10; September 18, 2022

**@ Caesars Superdome** – The New Orleans Saints may have been in position to break Tampa Bay.

Or, maybe not, because it's impossible to say definitively what "may" have happened if "this" or "that" had been successful or unsuccessful. All that is known for sure is what actually did happen.

And what happened for the Saints, in a 20-10 loss to the Buccaneers on Sunday in the Caesars Superdome, was this: A golden opportunity was lost in the third quarter, one which reverberated and raised the "what if" temperature by an extra 100 degrees in a game where points were at a premium due to the stinginess of two high-level defenses. On the drive after Tampa Bay tied the score at 3 with a 47-yard field goal, New Orleans opened its next drive at its 25 following a touchback. And the Saints went about constructing their most balanced and effective drive of the game, a mix of three passes (for 25 yards) and five runs (for 30 yards) that pushed New Orleans to first-and-10

from the Tampa Bay 20-yard line with 1:19 left in the quarter.

But with the Saints in scoring position, and touchdowns scarce among the two combatants, New Orleans couldn't throw what undoubtedly would have amounted to an offensive haymaker.

Running back **Mark Ingram II** took the handoff off left guard, manipulated his way through heavy traffic and as he anticipated contact, covered the football with both hands.

It wasn't enough.

As safety Logan Ryan and linebacker Lavonte David converged for the tackle, Ryan attacked the ball and executed a perfect punch-out at the 11-yard line. When linebacker Carl Nassib recovered at the 10, New Orleans went from the possibility of a lead-taking field goal and, perhaps, backbreaking touchdown, to an empty red zone trip and a score that remained 3-3.

With 71 seconds remaining in the third quarter, there remained sufficient time and opportunity for the Saints to rebound from the turnover and win the game. But the lost fumble was a heavy blow for the offense, which didn't again operate with that kind of rhythm and balance down the stretch.

Offensive Line Coach **Doug Marrone** - Played for the Miami Dolphins in 1987 and the Saints in 1989.

Passing Game Coordinator/Quarterbacks Coach **Ronald Curry** - A seventh round draft pick (235th overall) of the Oakland Raiders in 2002 out of the University of North Carolina and played for Oakland from 2002-08, appearing in 76 games with 32 starts, registering 193 receptions for 2,347 yards with 13 TDs.

Defensive Assistant **Sterling Moore** - enjoyed a seven-year NFL career with the Saints (2016-17), Buccaneers (2015), Dallas Cowboys (2012-14) and New England Patriots (2011-12), starting 31-of-75 career games, while accumulating 185 tackles, six interceptions, 41 passes defended, eight forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries. In his first season in New Orleans in 2016, Moore appeared in 13 games with 12 starts and registered a career-best 55 tackles (47 solo), two interceptions, a team-leading and career-high 14 passes defended and a forced fumble.

### BUCKING THE ODDS

The Saints have a long tradition of finding players as free agents signed after the draft that make an impact. Several play key roles.

Wide Receiver/Return Specialist **Deonte Harty** finished ranked second on the team with 570 receiving yards on 36 catches (team-best 15.8 avg., seventh in the NFL), while leading the club in kickoff return average (23.8 avg.) and punt return average (9.5 avg.) in 2021.

Wide receiver **Marquez Callaway** led the team in 2021 in two of four major receiving categories with a club-best 46 receptions for a team-high 698 yards (15.2 avg., ranked tenth in the NFL) and a club-best six TD grabs as the team's only offensive skill player to play in all 17 games.

Defensive end **Carl Granderson** played in 15 games in 2021 with three starts and posted 24 tackles and three sacks.

Punter **Blake Gillikin** enjoyed an October where he was selected as NFC Special Teams Player of the Month. He finished his first season in 2021 with punting duties ranked third in the league with 29 punts dropped inside the 20-yard line. In Week One, he picked up where he left off with a 46.0 net punting average.

**Defensive back** J.T. Gray led the NFL with 19 special teams stops (league-best 16 solo) and this season was voted by his teammates as the club's special teams captain and was selected to the Pro Bowl as a starter and as a first-team *Associated Press* All Pro.

Tight End **Juwan Johnson** led his position group with four touchdown receptions in 2021, converting to the position after playing in college and starting his Black and Gold career in 2020 as a wideout. In 2022, he leads his position group in receiving with six grabs for 83 yards.

Running Back **Tony Jones Jr.**, spent the entire 2021 campaign on the active roster after being elevated in Week 17 in 2020, rushing for 142 yards to provide depth to the running back position.

Offensive Lineman **Calvin Throckmorton** was one of two Saints linemen to play in all 17 games in his second season in 2021, starting four at right guard and the last nine contests at left guard.

Defensive Tackle **Shy Tuttle** joined the club in 2019 as an undrafted free agent and has played in 46 regular season games with 19 starts, posting 52 tackles, two sacks, one interception, seven passes defended, one forced fumble and one recovery for one of the league's top run defenses. In 2021, Tuttle played in all 17 games with 15 starts and finished with a career-high 48 tackles, three passes defended, one forced fumble and a fumble recovery in the season finale at Atlanta.

### PRACTICE MAKES PERFECT

A spot on the practice squad is another avenue to eventually get onto the active roster and have the opportunity to contribute. Below is an overview of players on the club's roster with extensive practice squad experience.

Running back **Dwayne Washington** participated on the Saints practice squad briefly in 2018 after spending most of the 2016 and 2017 seasons on Detroit's active roster. Through development, the tailback, in addition to his running skills, has developed into a core special teams player with 11 stops, to have a career-high seven for 2021.

Tight end **Juwan Johnson** was signed by New Orleans out of Oregon, where he spent his graduate transfer season following the 2020 NFL Draft as a wideout. Recording four receptions for 39 yards seven contests, Johnson spent the majority of the season on the practice squad. Converted to tight end in 2021 and leading the position group with four touchdowns, Johnson's took advantage of his frame and participation in his first full offseason strength and conditioning program in 2022 and leads the tight ends group with eight receptions for 63 yards.

After spending the last six weeks of the 2019 season and the first 16 weeks of the 2020 campaign on the team's practice squad, linebacker **Andrew Dowell** was elevated to the club's active roster for the regular season finale at Carolina. In two preseason games in 2021, he posted five tackles, one forced fumbles and two coverage spots to secure a regular season roster spot. In Week 3 at New England, Dowell recorded the first blocked punt that an opponent had against the Patriots since the 2015 season. Dowell's five special teams tackles on December 19 at Tampa Bay was the highest single-game total in the NFL in 2021 and he finished the season tied for fifth in the league with 14 coverage stops.

After splitting his rookie season in 2018 between the practice squad and active roster, defensive back **J.T. Gray** enjoyed a breakthrough campaign in 2019, when he was selected *Associated Press* second-team All-Pro when he recorded 16 special teams tackles, one blocked punt and one coverage fumble recovery. In 2021, he was selected as a first-team All-Pro and to his first career Pro Bowl (starter), when he led the NFL with 19 special teams tackles (league-leading 16 solo). Gray has two special special teams stops in 2022.

After spending the bulk of his rookie season on the Saints practice squad, fullback **Adam Prentice** joined the 53-man roster on November 25, 2021 and contributed on offense and special teams for New Orleans in the last seven contests with three starts. New Orleans logged at least 150 yards rushing in three of the team's final seven contests, including a season-high 193 in the season finale at Atlanta.

Originally signing as an undrafted free agent with Kansas City in 2014 out of BYU, safety **Daniel Sorensen** spent the first half of his rookie season on the Chiefs practice squad before being elevated to the active roster at midseason where he contributed with seven tackles. Expected to make his Saints debut on Sunday, Sorensen has played in 111 games with 41 starts, posting 378 tackles, 4.5 sacks, 12 interceptions, four returned for touchdowns, 33 passes defensed, four forced fumbles, three fumble recoveries, 29 coverage stops, one special teams fumble recovery and one blocked field goal.

A converted quarterback from college who ended up playing both safety and linebacker at Utah, **Chase Hansen** was originally signed by New Orleans as a free agent after the 2019 NFL Draft. After splitting the bulk of the 2021 season between the practice squad and the active roster where he recorded one special teams tackle in three games, Hansen recorded one coverage stop in the 2022 season-opening win at Atlanta on Sunday.

Ahead is a synopsis of several returning players and newcomers through the draft and free agency to the 2022 Saints offensive line:

**Tackle/Guard James Hurst** - An eight-year NFL veteran who was signed as a free agent from Baltimore in 2020, Hurst has 121 career regular season appearances with 66 starts at three different positions on the inside and outside. His versatility came in handy in 2020, as he started two contests at left tackle and one at left guard and the Saints gained over 200 yards rushing each time. In 2021, Hurst moved into the lineup for eight games at left tackle in place of an injured Armstead, two at left guard in place of an injured Andrus Peat and three at right tackle for an injured Ryan Ramczyk, starting contests at three different positions. Hurst started the season-opening victory at Atlanta at left tackle.

**Right Tackle Ryan Ramczyk** - The Black and Gold used their second first round selection in the 2017 NFL Draft to snag Ramczyk out of Wisconsin, one of the best linemen in the entire draft. After opening all 16 games and both postseason contests in 2017 and being selected as a PFWA All-Rookie, he has been selected as an AP All-Pro selection three times since.

**Center/Guard Erik McCoy** - New Orleans traded up in the second round of the 2019 NFL Draft to select this standout from Texas A&M, who was a three-year starter, anchoring the middle of the Aggies line. In 2018, he was a team captain who paved the way for the SEC's leading rusher and in 2019 was the first Saint in franchise history to start at center in Week One, opening all 16 regular season contests. McCoy opened all 16 contests and both postseason games in 2020 for the NFL's sixth-ranked rushing offense. McCoy started 13 contests at center in 2021. Prior to the Week One season opener at Atlanta, McCoy agreed to a five-year contract extension with the Saints.

**Guard/Center Cesar Ruiz** - The hard-working, talented and intelligent lineman is a perfect fit for New Orleans' culture with the 24th pick in the 2020 NFL Draft out of Michigan. The three-year letterman played in 36 games in college, starting his last 31 including the final 26 at center, earning All-Big Ten in 2019. Ruiz settled in at right guard in the last 15 games, with nine starts, as well as both post-season contests. When McCoy suffered a lower leg injury in the first quarter of the 2021 season-opening win over Green Bay, Ruiz transitioned over to his natural position, where the Saints did not give up a sack and started four contests in the middle. He returned to right guard on Oct. 25 at Seattle and was the only lineman in 2021 to not miss a start.

**Tackle/Guard Andrus Peat** - A first round selection (13th overall) in the 2015 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Peat was considered one of the top college linemen in 2014. In his first seven seasons, he's played in 85 regular season games with 80 starts, opening a contest at every position except center. In 2020, he opened 13 contests at left guard as he was part of the NFC Pro squad for the third consecutive season. In 2021, he opened the first six contests, where New Orleans got off to a 4-2 start before suffering a season-ending pectoral injury. In his return to the starting lineup on Sunday in Atlanta, New Orleans rushed for 151 yards.

**Tackle Landon Young** - A mainstay at left tackle for his entire college career at Kentucky, Young played in 49 contests with 30 starts in his college career. The Lexington, Ky. native was selected by New Orleans in the sixth round of the 2021 NFL Draft and held up to the competition in training camp to snare a roster spot. Young opened one contest at right tackle in 2021 and serves as Ramczyk's backup on the right side.

**Offensive Lineman Calvin Throckmorton** - This 6-5, 309 pound former four-year starter on the Oregon line was signed as an undrafted free agent in 2020, possessing the flexibility to play all five positions along the offensive line. After spending his rookie season on the practice squad, Throckmorton increased strength in the 2021 offseason and made strides in training camp, securing a roster spot. In his NFL debut in the 2021 season opening-win, Throckmorton was called to play right guard following a lower leg injury to McCoy in the first quarter, subsequently starting four contests. He then moved into left guard, Oct. 25 at Seattle following a shoulder injury to Andrus Peat and opened the last ten.

## DEFENSIVE NOTES

### DEFENSIVE DRAFTS

Over the last eight drafts from 2015-22, New Orleans has shown a commitment to defense, spending 21-of-33 picks on that side of the ball. With nine picks in 2015, the Saints picked six defensive players, the most taken since New Orleans chose nine in a 12-round selection meeting in 1990. Below is an overview of the defensive players selected by New Orleans from 2015-22 currently with the club:

**CB Paulson Adebo, Stanford (D3-21)** - Selected in the third round (76th overall) of the 2021 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Adebo finished his college career playing in 22 games with 21 starts and recording 97 tackles, 34 passes defended and eight interceptions, earning All-Pac-12 in 2018 and 2019. He started in the opener and became the first Saint to record an interception in his NFL debut since 2002. With three picks on the season, he became only the fifth Saints rookie to reach that level. Overall, he posted 63 tackles (54 solo), three picks and eight passes defended.

**LB Zack Baun, Wisconsin (D3a-20)** - Selected in the third round (74th overall) of the 2020 NFL Draft out of the Wisconsin, Baun finished his college career with 154 tackles, 15 sacks, two interceptions, one returned for a TD, six passes defended, three forced fumbles and a recovery. The Saints were attracted to his playmaking ability Baun finished with eight coverage stops in 2021, adding 22 defensive stops (16 solo) and a return of a blocked field goal. In 2022, he's recorded two coverage stops.

**DE Marcus Davenport, Texas-San Antonio (D1-18)** - Davenport joined the Saints with the 14th overall pick in the 2018 NFL Draft after showing potential and production as a pass rusher at Texas-San Antonio. In four seasons, Davenport posted 22 sacks, including 8.5 in 2017 when he captured Conference USA Defensive Player of the Year. Davenport's strength on the line is a valuable asset for the Saints front, posting six sacks in 13 games in 2019. Davenport finished second on the team with a career-high nine sacks and added a club-best three forced fumbles and a fumble recovery in 11 games with nine starts in 2021, despite missing six games.

**LB Kaden Elliss, Idaho (D7-19)** - New Orleans selected this four-year starter from Idaho to compete at both linebacker and contribute on special teams. The Salt Lake City native finished his college career with 288 stops 47 tackles for loss and 17 sacks. After missing the bulk of his rookie year with a knee injury, Elliss showed promise with five stops on coverage units in 2020 and in 2021, his progress continued with 13 stops, one sack, one fumble recovery and one special teams tackle.

**CB Marshon Lattimore, Ohio State (D1a-17)** - The 11th overall selection in the 2017 NFL draft out of Ohio State and the first corner taken possesses all the traits of a lockdown defender. With his agile, fluid style, Lattimore has the ability to shut down the best wide receivers. In 2017, he finished with 53 stops, five picks, to lead National Football League rookies and the Saints, tying a team rookie record, a club-best 18 passes defended, a forced fumble and a recovery. Lattimore was the first Saints corner selected to the Pro Bowl since 1995 and selected as *Associated Press* Defensive Rookie of the Year. His five takeaways in 2018 led the team, adding two more picks in the NFC Divisional Playoff win. In 2020, he led the cornerbacks with 63 tackles, two interceptions and ten passes defended as he was selected to his third Pro Bowl. In 2021, he was named the Week Six NFC Defensive Player of the Week, recording a career-high six passes defenses at Washington, the league's highest total since 2017, reaching the Pro Bowl for the fourth time. He finished the season with 68 tackles (53 solo), three picks, a career-high and league-best 19 passes defended and one fumble recovery to lead the team with four takeaways.

**DT David Onyemata, Manitoba (D4-16)** - Possessing a unique combination of size and speed, this Nigeria native had an impressive rookie year after becoming the first player from the University of Manitoba to be drafted into the NFL. Despite being new to football, the 2016 fourth round draft pick became a critical member on the interior of the Saints defensive front in 2017, playing in all 16 games with six starts, making 40 tackles and two sacks. Overall in his career, he has played in 89 contests with 51 starts, posting 218 stops, 18 sacks, one interception, five passes defended, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery. In 2021, Onyemata started all 11 games he played in and posted 34 tackles, two sacks for a loss of 17 yards and one one fumble recovery.

**DE Payton Turner, Houston (D1-21)** - Selected 28th overall in the first round of the 2021 NFL Draft, the Texas native comes off a senior campaign where he posted 10.5 tackles for loss and five sacks in only five contests. During his four collegiate seasons, Turner notched career totals of 115 tackles (68 solo), ten sacks, 25 tackles for loss, one interception, one forced fumble, ten passes defended and one blocked punt. Turner recorded five tackles and a sack in his NFL debut on September 19, 2021 at Carolina. After having his rookie campaign cut short by a shoulder injury, Turner came back strong in the 2022 season opener at Atlanta with his blocked field goal on the last play of the game securing a dramatic come-from behind 27-26 victory for New Orleans.

**LB Pete Werner, Ohio State (D2-21)** - New Orleans selected this three-year starter from Ohio State to compete at the linebacker position. The Indianapolis, Ind. native finished his college career playing in 47 career games with 35 starts, recording 185 tackles (111 solo), 16 stops for loss, four sacks, 11 passes defended, four forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Werner helped power the Buckeyes to the College Football Playoff championship game as a senior in 2020, when he was voted by Big Ten coaches as a first-team All-Conference selection and a Butkus Award semifinalist, posting 54 tackles, 2.5 stops for loss, one sack and two forced fumbles. Werner made his first career start in Week Three and on Oct. 3 vs. the New York Giants had ten tackles. Leading the team with 13 stops in Week 6 at the Washington Football Team, Werner became the first Saints rookie since 2015 to have back-to-back performances of double-digit stops. He finished his rookie campaign with 59 defensive tackles (33 solo) and three special teams stops on the season. In 2022, Werner, currently leads the New Orleans defense with 20 stops, one forced fumble, one pass defense and one coverage tackle.

**CB Alontae Taylor, Tennessee (D2-22)** - A four-year starter at Tennessee, this 6-foot, 193-pound defender possesses a combination of speed, instincts and versatility needed to excel both on defense and special teams. After playing quarterback in high school and starting his college career at wide receiver, he took to the secondary quickly, finishing his college career with totals of 162 tackles (115 solo), a split sack, five stops for loss, three forced fumbles, one fumble recovery for a touchdown, four interceptions, one returned 56 yards for a touchdown, 17 passes defended and one blocked punt. Taylor made his regular season debut on defense in Sunday's contest vs. Tampa Bay in the fourth quarter and picked up a pass defense.

**DB P.J. Williams, Florida State (D3b-15)** - Williams' career was initially limited by missing all but two games his first two seasons, but he's rebounded to miss only four contests with injury since. An experienced starter from Florida State, who developed into one of the nation's top cover corners, in 2019, he made 41 stops, a sack, an interception and three passes defended, serving as the team's nickel corner. In the Dec. 22, 2019 win at Tennessee, Williams further showed his versatility by making the switch to safety after Marcus Williams was forced to depart with a groin injury and then starting in Williams' place in the regular season finale at Carolina. In 2020, Williams posted 37 tackles, a club-best two defensive fumble recoveries, one interception and two passes defended in 15 games, as he played both cornerback and safety. Williams finished tied for the team lead with three picks in 2021 and added 42 tackles (36 solo), two sacks, four passes defended and one forced fumble, playing in 16 games with four starts. In 2022, Williams will play in multiple positions in the secondary.

### IN THE NFL

The New Orleans defense has made great strides in all areas after Head Coach Dennis Allen became defensive coordinator midway through the 2015 campaign. After ranking fourth in 2020, the New Orleans defense finished the 2021 season ranked seventh in the NFL in 2021 in opponent net yards per game.

The Saints have stopped the run impressively the past four seasons. In seven straight games in 2018, they didn't surrender 100 rushing yards to an opponent for the first time since 2007 had a seven-game run in 2020. In 2021, the Saints didn't give up 100 yards rushing in their last four contests. Below are the longest streaks in team history the defense has gone without surrendering 100 yards. Between 2017-20 they didn't allow a 100-yard rusher in a 55 straight games (regular season/postseason), the longest streak in NFL history. In holding Buccaneers TB Ronald Jones to nine yards on Nov. 8, New Orleans' efforts produced dominant results as his rushing total was the lowest for a leading rusher for an opponent during the streak. Keeping San Francisco RB Jerrick McKinnon to 18 carries for 33 yards (1.8 avg.), New Orleans set the NFL record for the longest streak of keeping individual rushers under 100. After the last streak ended, New Orleans again had the longest current NFL streak of not surrendering a 100-yard rusher until the 2022 opener when 120 rushing yards were given up to Atlanta RB Cordarelle Patterson. New Orleans got back to their run-stopping ways in Week Two vs. Tampa Bay, when they gave up only 72 yards rushing on 30 carries (2.4 avg.) with zero touchdowns.

## SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

**Deonte Harty** has made an impact on New Orleans' return game since being picked up an undrafted free agent in 2019. Harris was signed following the NFL Draft out of NCAA Division II Assumption, where he finished his college career as one of the most prolific returners in NCAA history. In the final game of his college career, he set the NCAA-All Division record for career combined return TDs (14).

In 2019, Harty brought back 36 punts for 338 yards (9.4 avg.), ranked first in the NFC and fourth in the National Football in punt return average, ranked second among rookies, following a 53-yard runback for a touchdown in the first quarter of the Sept. 22 33-27 win at Seattle.

He also returned 24 kickoffs for 644 yards (26.8 avg.), second in the NFC and third in the NFL and has recorded one special teams stop. On offense Harty carried twice for 18 yards (9.0 avg.) and caught six passes for 24 yards.

Harris is the first player signed by New Orleans as an undrafted rookie following the draft to be selected to the Pro Bowl as a rookie.

Overall, Harty 25.8 kickoff return average ranked fourth in Saints club record books, while his 9.9 punt return average ranks sixth. He's added 64 receptions for 793 yards (12.4 avg.) with four TDs to serve as an offensive threat.

**Blake Gillikin** was signed by New Orleans following the 2020 NFL Draft after a college career at Penn State, where he finished tied for second on the Nittany Lions' career gross punting average charts (43.03). After spending his

rookie season on Injured Reserve, Gillikin had a 42.0 net punting average, eighth in the league and 29 inside-the-20 yard line, third in the NFL and tying the single-season club record. Gillikin enjoyed a breakout performance in Week 5, where he had three punts drop inside-the-three-yard line at Washington, flipping the field position battle and becoming the first punter since at least 2000 to have three punts of 53-plus yards downed inside the three-yard line. In the Oct. 31 win over Tampa Bay, Gillikin punted at a 48.0 net clip and had a career-best 63-yard punt, helping him earn October's NFC Special Teams Player of the Month.

Kicker **Wil Lutz** went undrafted in 2016, joining the Ravens for training camp. Prior to the start of the regular season, Lutz joined the Black and Gold. Lutz has kicked in 81 games, converting 144-of-167 field goal attempts (86.2 percent) and 254-of-261 PATs (97.3 percent). He's recorded 322 touchbacks, the sixth-most in the NFL since 2016 despite missing the 2021 campaign with an abdominal injury. His 86.2 percent field goal percentage is best among kickers in team history. Until the 2018 regular season finale, he'd kicked a field goal in a club-record 36 consecutive games, second-longest streak in NFL history. In scoring three points on December 6, 2020 at Atlanta to reach 101, Lutz joined Pro Football Hall of Famer Morten Andersen (1985-89) as only the second Saint to score at least 100 points in five consecutive seasons, Lutz doing it in the first five years of his career. Lutz returned to the field with an immediate impact in the season-opening win at Atlanta on Sept. 11, drilling a 51-yard game winning field goal through the uprights with 19 seconds remaining to help secure a 27-26 victory for the Saints.

One of the club's two third round draft picks in 2020, Baun, a former Wisconsin standout, embraced work on the club's coverage units in 2020 with three stops. On Sept. 19 at Carolina, he made an adept play by returning a blocked field goal and was ranked fourth on the team with eight stops. After posting eight stops in 2021, Baun has two coverage tackles in 2022.

After spending the bulk of the 2019 and 2020 season on the Saints practice squad, Dowell recorded his first career blocked punt on September 26 at New England. He ranked second on the team with 14 stops and was tied for fifth in the NFL after having a career-high five tackles (four solo) on December 19 at Tampa Bay, the highest single-game total in the National Football League in 2021.

A seventh round draft pick of New Orleans in 2019, Elliss' blue collar mentality fit in with the coverage units with four stops in both 2020 and 2021.

Sorensen's a ninth-year NFL veteran who signed with New Orleans as an unrestricted free agent from Kansas City after spending the first eight seasons of his career in Kansas City, posting 29 coverage stops, one special teams fumble recovery and one blocked field goal to go with 378 defensive tackles, 4.5 sacks, 12 interceptions, 33 passes defended, four forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries.

Signed by the Saints after the 2018 NFL Draft out of Mississippi State, Gray enjoyed a banner campaign in 2021, emerging as one of the league's elite players on special teams. Voted by his teammates as the club's special teams captain for the first time, Gray led the NFL with 19 special teams tackles in 16 games and added three defensive stops as he was selected as a Pro Bowl starter and as the team's only first-team *Associated Press* All-Pro. Playing in 54 career games, Gray has career totals of 46 special teams stops, one blocked punt, three fumble recoveries and five defensive tackles and one pass defended, recording two tackles in the season-opening victory at Atlanta.

A national champion wrestler in high school as well as a two-time California state champion, Prentice brings physicality to two of the most physical areas of football. Contributing on both coverage units and the run/pass game with his blocking and pass-catching abilities, this former Fresno State and South Carolina standout recorded one stop in limited action in 2021 and had his first tackle of 2022 on Sunday vs. Tampa Bay.

Originally a seventh round draft pick of the Detroit Lions in 2016, since being promoted to the Saints active roster from the practice squad at the start of the 2018 season, the former University of Washington standout has become a core special teamer for New Orleans. Washington has recorded 15 stops, deflected a punt and recovered a blocked punt, posting a career-best seven stops in 2021. Pressed into tailback duty on Sunday vs. Tampa Bay as well, Washington responded with four carries for 18 yards, including a key third down conversion in the third quarter.

## QUARTERBACKS

### JAMEIS WINSTON

• Winston signed with New Orleans as an unrestricted free agent after the 2020 NFL Draft after starting all 16 games for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2019, completing 380-of-626 passes (60.7%) for 5,109 yards with 33 touchdowns and an 84.3 passer rating, also carrying 59 times for 250 yards with one touchdown. Winston's NFL-high passing yardage total was the eighth-highest total in NFL record books as he became only the eighth passer to reach 5,000 yards in a season. In Week 14 and 15 wins, Winston tossed for 456 and 458 yards, becoming the only player in

NFL history to pass for 450 yards in consecutive contests.

• Overall, the Bessemer, Ala. Native has appeared in 85 regular season games with 79 starts, completing 1,713-of-2,794 passes (61.3%) for 21,487 yards with 138 touchdowns, 94 interceptions and an 87.7 passer rating, while adding 1,215 rushing yards and 11 touchdowns. After seeing limited action in 2020, Winston secured the starting spot in the 2021 preseason. Before suffering a season-ending knee injury in Week Eight, Winston completed 95-of-161 passes for 1,170 yards, 14 touchdowns, three interceptions and a 102.8 passer rating, ranked first in the NFL at the time of his injury in touchdown percentage (8.7).

• Through the first two contests of the 2022 season, Winston has completed 48-of-74 passes for 505 yards with three touchdowns, three interceptions and an 81.2 passer rating.

## FAMILIAR FOE

New Orleans Saints quarterback Jameis Winston has played this week's opponent, the Carolina Panthers, 11 times, starting ten contests and posting a 4-6 record in the ten starts. In the ten starts, nine with Tampa Bay and one with New Orleans in 2021, Winston has completed 212-of-351 passes (60.4%) for 2,578 yards with nine touchdowns and 16 interceptions, while carrying 34 times for 145 yards and two touchdowns. All four of the wins he has engineered have been by seven points or less, while his first two required fourth quarter game-winning drives. His 2,578 passing yards against the Panthers are second against an opponent to the 2,768 against Atlanta, needing 191 on Sunday for his Panthers figure to be the most against an opponent.

With both of them Heisman Trophy winners, Winston has faced off against Panthers starting signal-caller once. In an October 12, 2018, 26-23 victory over Mayfield's Cleveland Browns. Mayfield and the Browns actually tied the score with 2:28 left in regulation on a 16-yard scoring connection to current Saints wideout Jarvis Landry. Winston then led Tampa Bay to the Cleveland 22-yard line, but a 40-yard field goal was missed as regulation ended. In overtime, Winston completed a pass for a 14-yard gain to wide receiver DeSean Jackson to set up a successful game-winning 59-yard field goal attempt. In the victory, Winston accounted for 420 total yards of offense, leading his team in both passing yards (365) and rushing (55 yards and one touchdown).

## POWERFUL STARTS

• Winston improved his record in season-opening starts to 4-2 and became only the third Saints quarterback to win his first two season-opening starts as a member of the Black and Gold. Returning to the lineup after an extensive rehabilitation process, Winston completed 21-of-30 passes for 269 yards and two touchdowns for 213 yards, two touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 111.0 passer rating in the 27-26 win over Atlanta on Sept. 11.

• In the Sept. 12, 2021 season opener vs. Green Bay played in Jacksonville, Fla., Winston had one of the most impressive first starts in a Black and Gold uniform amongst its signal-callers. He passed for 148 yards on 14-of-20 passing (70.0%) with a 130.8 rating. Winston threw five touchdown passes, with a long of 55 yards on a pass to Deonte Harris. His five touchdown passes tied a career high from when he threw five touchdowns against Philadelphia (11/22/15) as a member of the Buccaneers. He also finished with 37 rushing yards on six attempts. In his first start with the Saints, Winston became the third player since 1950 to throw for five touchdowns in his first start with a team. Winston's 148 passing yards is the fewest yards with five passing touchdowns since 1948. With zero interceptions, Winston became the first quarterback in NFL history to throw five touchdown passes with no interceptions in his first career start with a new team in an opener. Overall, Winston became the seventh quarterback with five touchdowns and no interceptions in an opener, and first since Baltimore QB Lamar Jackson did so at Miami on Sept. 8, 2019. Winston became the 33rd player to start a game at quarterback for New Orleans, and the 11th to win in his first start. The victory was Winston's first career win over Green Bay.

## COMEBACK KID

• In the Sept. 11 come-from-behind victory, Winston engineered the Saints from a 16-point fourth quarter deficit for the first time in franchise history. In leading two touchdown drives and the game-winning field goal drive, he completed 13-of-16 passes (81.3 percent) for 213 yards with two touchdowns and a perfect 158.3 passer rating in the final period of the contest. It was the 13th fourth quarter/overtime comeback of Winston's career.

## SECOND THROUGH FIVE

In his first five National Football League seasons, Jameis Winston threw for 19,737 yards, the second-most yards ever by a player from their rookie season through their fifth season.

Bengals out of TCU, Dalton has played in 152 career games with 148 starts for Cincinnati (2011-19), Dallas (2020) and Chicago (2021) and completed 3,122-of-5,018 passes (62.2 pct.) for 35,279 yards, 226 touchdowns, 135 interceptions and an 87.0 passer rating.

- In two preseason appearances, Dalton was flawless, completing ten-of-ten passes for 124 yards and a 151.7 passer rating and will serve as the backup to Winston.

## RUNNING BACKS

### ALVIN KAMARA

- A talented runner and receiver with a 5-10, 215-pound frame who was selected by the Saints in the third round of the 2017 NFL Draft out of the University of Tennessee, Kamara enjoyed an outstanding rookie campaign. He ranked first on the club and sixth in the NFL in yards from scrimmage (1,554), second on the team in rushing and receiving, carrying 120 times for 728 yards (6.1 avg.) with eight TDs and a two-point conversion, catching 81 passes for 826 yards (10.2 avg.) with five TDs and a kickoff return for a TD for a club rookie record 14 total scores, tied for second in the NFL. Kamara finished first in the NFL in yards per carry.

- Kamara was the first Saints offensive rookie selected to the Pro Bowl since Rueben Mayes (1986), as an *Associated Press* second team All-Pro (flex), the clubs' first rookie All-Pro since 1993. He was named *The Sporting News* NFL Rookie of the Year and *AP* NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year.

• In 2020, Kamara even exceeded expectations as one of the NFL's most electric players in the NFL. He carried 187 times for a career-high 932 yards (5.0 avg.) with 16 touchdowns, tied for first in the NFL. He led running backs in receiving with a career-high and team best 83 receptions for 756 yards (9.1 avg.) with five TDs. Kamara, who was the second Saint to lead the team in rushing and receiving, led the NFL with a team-record 21 total touchdowns, was second with 93 first downs and third with a career-best 1,688 yards from scrimmage, the seventh-highest total in club history.

• Despite missing four games in the middle of the 2021 season with a knee injury, Kamara led the Saints in rushing and receiving, for the second consecutive season carrying 240 times for 898 yards and four TDs and catching 47 passes for 439 yards with five TDs for a club-best 1,337 yards from scrimmage, surpassing wide receiver Marques Colston (2009-12), running back Mark Ingram II (2014-17) and wide receiver Michael Thomas (2016-19) as the first Saint to have 1,000 total yards from scrimmage in his first five seasons and/or in five consecutive seasons. New Orleans posted a 9-4 record in the 13 games that Kamara appeared in.

## TOUCHDOWN LEADER

In the Saints' 2020 Christmas 52-33 win over the Vikings, Kamara tied the National Football League record for total touchdowns and rushing touchdowns, as he carried 22 times for a career-high 155 yards (7.0 avg.), adding three receptions for 17 yards for 172 yards from scrimmage. The rushing touchdowns record tied the record held by Ernie Nevers of the Chicago Cardinals since Nov. 28, 1929, while for total touchdowns, Kamara joins Nevers, Cleveland's Dub Jones (Nov. 25, 1951) and Chicago's Gayle Sayers (Dec. 12, 1965). The performance catapulted Kamara to the NFL's touchdown lead, as he joined running back Dalton Hilliard as only the second Saint to lead the league in touchdowns.

• One of the club's two first round draft picks in 2011, the 2009 Heisman Trophy winner has an integral part of the rushing attack since his arrival in New Orleans as the 28th overall pick. In 11 NFL seasons, Ingram has played in 148 games with 98 starts, carrying 1,769 times for 7,960 yards (4.5 avg.) with 64 touchdowns, also catching 290 passes for 2,061 yards with ten touchdowns for 20,032 total yards from scrimmage. **TONY JONES JR.**

• After spending the majority of his rookie season on the Saints practice squad after signing as an undrafted free agent out of Notre Dame, Jones secured a spot on the team's 53-man roster at the start of the season for the second consecutive year in 2022 after rushing for 69 yards in the preseason and leading the team in receiving with six grabs for 45 yards. In the 2021 regular season, Jones appeared in 11 games with four starts and carried 54 times for 142 yards and added five catches for 29 yards.

**WIDE RECEIVERS****MICHAEL THOMAS**

• A talented wideout with a 6-3, 212-pound frame who was selected by the Saints in the second round of the 2016 NFL Draft out of Ohio State, Thomas had an outstanding rookie campaign, leading the team with 92 receptions for 1,137 yards and a nine touchdowns. He became the first Saints rookie to break 1,000 yards since Marques Colston (1,038-2006). In 2017, Thomas was New Orleans' receiving leader, making a club-record 104 receptions for 1,245 yards with five TDs to rank third in the league and making him only the second player in NFL record books, joining Odell Beckham Jr. to have 90 catches in each of his first two seasons, his 196 grabs being the most by a player in in his first two seasons.

## TRIUMPHANT RETURN

After being hobbled by ankle and hamstring injuries in 2020 that caused him to miss nine games and missing the entire 2021 campaign, Thomas returned in a big way in the team's 27-26 come-from-behind win at Atlanta to open the 2022 season on Sept. 11. After being held without a catch in the first half, Thomas came out and caught five passes for 57 yards with two fourth quarter touchdown grabs to power the team's comeback to a win for the first time in franchise history after being down by 16 points in the fourth quarter of a contest. On Sunday vs. Tampa Bay, Thomas led the team in receiving with six grabs for 65 yards and a fourth quarter touchdown, to currently be tied for first in the NFL in scoring grabs. (three).

## BY THE NUMBERS

**521** - Career grabs, the fourth-highest total in club history and fourth in the league since 2016 despite missing the 2021 campaign. His 470 receptions from 2016-19 are the most by a player through his first four seasons and his 510 the most through a player's first five seasons. Reaching 500 grabs in his 69th career contests, Thomas reached the mark the quickest in NFL record books. With three grabs on Sunday at Carolina, Thomas would move into third place in club record books in receiving and need 12 to move into second.

## JARVIS LANDRY

- Signed by New Orleans as a free agent after the 2022 NFL Draft, this former Litcher High School and LSU stand-out returns home as one of the league's most accomplished receivers has quickly established chemistry with Thomas and continuity with Jameis Winston and the Saints offense to become one of his top targets. Posting career totals in 125 career games with 114 Starts with the Miami Dolphins (2014-17), Cleveland Browns (2018-21) and Saints (2022), the five-time Pro Bowler has produced 699 catches for 7,737 yards with 37 touchdowns. He ranks fourth in the NFL in receptions since coming into the league as a second round pick of the Dolphins in 2014. Landry is just one of four players to have 695-plus catches since 2014. Since being drafted in 2014, Landry is ranked fourth in the league in receptions (699), eighth in first down receptions (398) and ninth in receiving yards (7,737).

## HOMECOMING

Landry made an immediate impact in the uniform of his home state team on Sept. 11 at Atlanta, grabbing a team-leading seven passes for a team-high 114 yards (club-best 16.3 yards per reception), with four of his catches going for first downs. Landry was particularly clutch on New Orleans' drive for the game-winning field goal late in the fourth quarter, when he made a difficult catch for a 40-yard gain, the longest reception of the game for the Saints. Landry and Thomas are currently tied for the team lead in receiving with 11 receptions apiece, while Landry leads the club in receiving yardage (139). In two previous appearances against this Sunday's opponent, Carolina as a member of the Dolphins (11/13/2017) and Browns (12/9/18), Landry has recorded eight grabs for 99 yards with two touchdowns, also rushing for a career-high 54 yards and having a career-long 51-yard rush in the 26-20 victory as a member of Cleveland

## TWO AT A TIME

Since Week 2 of his rookie season in 2014 until Week 2 of the 2021 campaign, Landry caught at least two passes in 111 consecutive games. His streak was the best in the NFL since 2014 and was the fourth-longest all-time.

## MARQUEZ CALLAWAY

•After a productive college career on offense and special teams at Tennessee, Callaway joined the Black and Gold as an undrafted free agent in 2020. Appearing in 11 games with three starts, Callaway posted 21 receptions for 213 yards and also made an impact as a gunner and punt returner. He returned 11 punts for 122 yards (11.1 avg.), four kickoff returns for 94 yards (23.5 avg.) and recovered two punts on special teams. In 2021, Callaway built an impressive all-around sophomore campaign. As the only Saints skill position player to play in all 17 games, Callaway provided consistency to the position, recording 46 receptions for a club-best 698 yards with a team-high six touchdowns.

## Q FACTOR

In the September 26, 2021 win at New England, Callaway had four receptions for 48 yards and scored his first career NFL touchdown from Jameis Winston.

The former University of Tennessee standout then made a couple of big catches on October 3 vs. the New York Giants, catching two receptions for 74 yards, including a 58-yard grab in the second half.

In the Week Five win at Washington, Callaway posted four receptions for 85 yards with a career-high two touchdowns, including a perfectly anticipated 49-yard "Hail Mary" scoring

reception from Winston at the end of the first half.

Although Callaway had only three receptions for 32 yards in the Oct. 25 win at Seattle, he saved his best for last with a fourth quarter 13-yard reception that advanced New Orleans to the Seahawks six-yard line and set up a 33-yard field goal.

Callaway's two receptions for 37 yards came at a crucial time in the November 14 contest at Tennessee, as he caught a grab for a 22-yard gain on the first play of New Orleans' final drive and then caught a 15-yard touchdown on third-and-13 on the drive to put the Saints within two.

Callaway caught a 26-yard pass from QB Trevor Siemian in the end zone of the November 21 contest at Philadelphia to give him a team-leading six scoring grabs.

On December 19 at Tampa Bay, Callaway posted six receptions for a career-high 112 yards, including grabs of 33 and 40 yards to help pace the passing offense.

In the Jan. 2, 2022 win over Carolina, Callaway helped spark the New Orleans pass offense with a game-high six grabs for a game-high 97 yards, including crucial 28- and 15-yard receptions on a two minute drive at the end of the first half to set up a field goal as time expired at the end of the second quarter to close New Orleans' halftime deficit to one.

## TRE'QUAN SMITH

• A talented fifth-year wideout, who was selected by New Orleans in the third round of the 2018 draft out of Central Florida, the 6-1, 210-pounder emerged as one of the Knights' top weapons from 2015-17 and was a key figure in their emergence. During that period, he caught 168 passes for 2,748 yards (16.4 avg.) with 22 touchdowns. In his final campaign for the 13-0 Knights in 2017, Smith appeared in and started all 13 games and hauled in 54 receptions for 1,082 yards (19.9 avg.) and 13 touchdowns.

• Smith recorded five touchdowns apiece in each of his first two seasons and achieved more consistency in 2020, when he posted a career-high 34 receptions for 448 yards (13.2 avg.) with four touchdowns to rank fourth on the Black and Gold in receiving. He was activated off Injured Reserve for the NFC Divisional Playoff vs. Tampa Bay, where he recorded three receptions for 85 yards (28.3 avg.) with two touchdowns.

• Activated off Injured Reserve on October 25, 2021, Smith played in 11 of the last 12 games in the 2021 campaign and recorded 32 receptions for 377 yards with three touchdowns, finishing his season on a high note at Atlanta in the regular season finale, when he posted five grabs for 76 yards and a TD.

**DEONTE HARTY**

- This fourth-year wideout initially made his mark for New Orleans in the return game, where he was selected to the Pro Bowl as a rookie. In addition to return duties in 2021, Harty enjoyed a breakout season on offense, when he recorded 36 receptions for 570 yards (15.8 avg.) with three touchdowns, finishing seventh in the NFL in yards per catch. Harris also returned 21 punts for 199 yards (9.5 avg.) and brought back 26 kickoffs for 690 yards (23.8 avg.) to spark the New Orleans return game.

**CHRIS OLAVE**

- A talented wide receiver who became one of the most prolific receivers in Buckeyes history, Olave played in 47 games and caught 176 passes for 2,711 yards (15.4 avg.) with 35 touchdowns. Olave's 35 career touchdown receptions set an Ohio State program record and ranks fourth in Big Ten history. His 11 career 100-yard games also ranks second in school history. Olave entered the starting lineup in 2019 with immediate results. He helped lead the Buckeyes to three consecutive Big Ten championships (2018-2020) and back-to-back College Football Playoff appearances (2019, 2020). In the 2020 CFP Semifinal vs. Clemson, Olave had a career night, hauling in six passes for 132 yards and two touchdowns in a 49-28 win, securing a bid to play in the championship game. Olave will look to integrate into the Saints offense in training camp after a standout senior campaign, where he caught 65 passes for 936 yards (14.4 avg.) and 13 touchdowns, tied for sixth nationally, as he was selected as an AFCA first-team All-American and a consensus second-team All-American.

- Olave had an impressive debut in the Sept. 11 win at Atlanta, when he recorded three catches for 41 yards, as well as a successful two-point conversion and on Sunday at Tampa Bay, posted five receptions for a club-best 80 yards, including a 51-yard grab.

**TIGHT ENDS****ADAM TRAUTMAN**

- The Saints were pleased to find the 6-5, 253-pound Trautman available near the end of the third round of the 2020 NFL Draft and made an aggressive trade up to the 105th pick to add him out of Dayton. A converted high school quarterback, the Michigan native moved to tight end as a freshman developed into one of the top offensive player in NCAA FCS football, where he played in 44 games, recording 178 receptions for 2,295 yards (12.9 avg.) and 31 touchdowns. Though 16 contests in 2020, Trautman posted 15 receptions for 171 yards with one touchdown while also

impressively developing his blocking ability.

- In 2021, Trautman continued progress in both blocking and pass-catching, leading the tight end unit with 27 grabs for 263 yards and two touchdowns. Prior to being sidelined by a knee injury for three weeks, Trautman had recorded five catches in the team's Week 10 and 11 contests. Trautman will seek to pick up on this momentum in the 2022 offseason/preseason.

**TAYSOM HILL**

- Hill's brought unheralded versatility to the Saints offense and special teams. A constant participant on special teams from midseason in 2017 to midseason in 2020, as well as the backup signal-caller and as a runner and receiver, in 2018, Hill averaged 24.9 yards per return on 14 kickoff returns, had six coverage stops, second on the team, completed a ten-yard pass on a fake punt and blocked a punt. Overall, Hill carried 37 times for 196 yards (5.3 avg.), third on the team, with two touchdowns and completed three of seven passes for 64 yards. The blocked punt that sparked a division-clinching win at Tampa Bay, earning him Week 14 NFC Special Teams Player of the Week honors. In the postseason, he caught a touchdown, made a special teams tackle and executed a successful fake punt, making significant contributions in all facets as the team advanced to the NFC Championship game for the third time in franchise history.

- In 2019, Hill carried 27 times for 156 yards (5.8 avg.) with a touchdown, catching 19 passes for 234 yards with six TDs, deflecting a punt and posting two coverage stops. He ranked third on the club in touchdowns and third in receiving TDs. After a multi-threat performance Thanksgiving night at Atlanta, when he deflected a punt and caught and rushed for a touchdown. Hill became the first quarterback to rush for and catch a touchdown in the same contest since Jim McMahon (1983). In a valiant postseason effort vs. Minnesota, Hill led the team in rushing with four carries for 50 yards, caught two passes for 25 yards with a TD and completed a 50-yard pass.

- In 2020, Hill contributed on multiple facets, completing 88-of-121 passes (72.7%) for 928 yards with a 98.8 rating, rushing 87 times for 457 (5.3 avg.) yards with eight touchdowns, catching eight passes for 98 yards with a TD and playing on special teams units until Brees' rib injury. Following Brees' injury, November 15, Hill went 3-1 in four starts.



•In 12 games with nine starts in 2021, providing value at quarterback on offense and special teams, he completed 78-of-134 passes for 978 yards with four touchdowns, carried 70 times for 374 yards (5.3 avg.) with a club-best five touchdowns, caught four passes for 52 yards and added a special teams stop. In 2022, Hill will assist the Black and Gold offense in multiple facets. Making his debut in that role, he contributed on both offense and special teams in the season opener at Atlanta, Hill carried four times for a club-best 81 yards (20.3 avg.), including a career-long 57-yard carry, as well as an 11-yard rushing touchdown on the same first quarter drive of his long run. Hill also caught a pass for a two-yard gain and contributed on multiple special teams units both on the coverage and return teams.

## DEFENSIVE ENDS

### CAMERON JORDAN

•New Orleans' first choice in the 2011 NFL Draft (24th overall) out of the University of California, Jordan enjoyed another standout season in 2021, recording 59 tackles (38 solo), 12.5 sacks for a loss of 75.5 yards, tied for seventh in the NFL, including 8.5 takedowns in the last four contests to lead the league over that period, six passes defended and two forced fumbles. Jordan was selected to his seventh Pro Bowl, the most by a defensive player in club history and ranked second overall in team records. With 107 sacks in his first 11 seasons, Jordan is ranked second on the Saints career sack list and ranked 27th on the National Football League's all-time quarterback takedown list. He's also proven to be one of the league's best run defenders, playing an important role in top five rush defenses in each of the past four seasons, headlining the only defense in the NFL to rank both in the top five in run defense and sacks over that period.

**FOUR IN A ROW**

Jordan has had three consecutive contests of at least one sack in 2013, 2014, 2016, 2017-19 and in 2021. With at least one sack in the final four contests of 2021, Jordan did so twice in a season for the first time. In the January 9 regular season finale at Atlanta, when Jordan dropped Falcons signal-caller Matt Ryan for the 23rd time, he finished the campaign with least one takedown in four consecutive games for the second time in his career, which matched a stretch from October 6-October 27, 2019.

## CARL GRANDERSON

•Signed by New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Wyoming in 2019, Granderson posted 17.5 career sacks in college and possesses the perfect body type for a pass rusher. As a rookie, Granderson appeared in eight regular season contests, posting ten tackles and one sack. In 2020, Granderson added 11 tackles, five sacks, ranked fourth on the team, a club-best two forced fumbles and one pass defended as he has seen more extensive time in the club's defensive line rotation as his game experience has continued to increase. On September 19, 2021 at Carolina, Granderson received his first start in place of an injured Marcus Davenport and blocked his first career field goal on special teams. In Week Five at the Washington Football Team, Granderson recorded his first takedown of 2021. He made his second on Thanksgiving night at Buffalo against his former Wyoming college teammate, Bills QB Josh Allen and had a key third quarter takedown on December 12 at the New York Jets against another high draft pick, New York signal-caller Zach Wilson.

## PAYTON TURNER

•With the 28th overall pick in the 2021 NFL Draft, the Saints added to the line with this gifted pass rusher. He appeared in five games in 2021 before spending the remainder of his rookie season on Injured Reserve (shoulder). Turner recorded 12 tackles (nine solo) and one sack while also appearing on special teams. A full recovery from the shoulder injury and hard work in the team's offseason program led to an impressive preseason for Turner. His work paid off in the season opener at Atlanta, when he blocked a 63-yard field goal attempt as time expired to secure the 27-26 win.

**DAVID ONYEMATA**

• A fourth round selection out of Manitoba in 2016, Onyemata teams with Shy Tuttle to form a solid duo in the interior of the Saints defensive line. In 82 games with 44 starts in six seasons, he has posted 190 career tackles, 16.5 sacks, five passes defended, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery. In 2019, he opened all 15 regular season games he played in, posting 32 stops, one pass defended and three sacks for the NFL's fourth-ranked run defense. Onyemata was re-signed to a three-year contract by the Saints in the 2020 offseason and finished ranked third on the team with 6.5 quarterback takedowns, tied for sixth in the league among defensive tackles and one interception, starting every contest for a unit ranked fourth in the NFL in opponent net yards per game and fourth in run defense. In 2021, he anchored an interior that has helped the Saints defense currently ranked first in the league in opponent yards per rushing and fourth in opponent rushing yards per game.

**SHY TUTTLE**

• Signed as an undrafted free agent out of the University of Tennessee in 1999, Tuttle contributed to a defensive unit in 2021 that ranked fourth in the NFL in run defense, seventh in total defense, and eighth in sacks. He played in all 17 games with 15 starts and posted 48 tackles (17 solo), three passes defended, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery. In his first three seasons in New Orleans, Tuttle has appeared in 48 regular season games, with 21 starts, recording 107 tackles (48 solo), 2.5 sacks, one interception, eight passes defended, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery. In three postseason contests, he's made eight stops (five solo) and two passes defended.

**KENTAVIUS STREET**

• Signed with New Orleans at the start of the offseason, this fourth-year defensive lineman brings positional versatility to a formidable Saints defensive front. Originally a fourth round draft selection in the 2018 NFL Draft (128th overall) out of North Carolina State by San Francisco, Street enjoyed his most productive campaign in 2021. He appeared in all 17 regular season games with two starts, posting career-highs across the board; 27 tackles (15 solo), three sacks, six tackles for loss and one forced fumble, adding two more solo stops in three postseason contests as San Francisco advanced to the NFC Championship Game. Overall, the Greenville, N.C. native has appeared in 36 career regular season games with four starts for the 49ers and Saints, posting career totals of 45 tackles (26 solo), three sacks for a loss of 17 yards and one forced fumble.

**LINEBACKERS****DEMARIO DAVIS**

• This dependable and sure-tackling defender joined the New Orleans Saints after a breakout 2017, where he started 16 games for the Jets. Davis posted a team-high and career-high 165 tackles (112 solo) and a career-best five sacks. For his career, the Brandon, Miss. native has appeared in 162 games with 148 starts for the Jets (2012-15, 2017), Cleveland (2016) and Saints, recording 1,117 stops (743 solo), 29.5 sacks, two interceptions, 45 passes defended, three forced fumbles, seven fumble recoveries and 24 special team stops.

• In 2018, Davis opened all 16 contests and led the team with 110 stops (74 solo), five sacks to lead the linebackers, four passes defended, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. Davis' abilities to diagnose and tackle played a key role in New Orleans ranking second in the NFL in opponent rushing yards per game and opponent rushing yards per play. Participating in the postseason for the first time, Davis led the defense with 22 stops (15 solo), an interception in the NFC Championship and a pass defense. In 2019, he posted 111 stops, ranked first on the club, four sacks, one interception and 11 passes defended to help spur the league's fourth-ranked run defense.

• In 2020, Davis filled up the stat sheet with a team-leading 119 tackles (74 solo), four sacks and six passes defended. Davis became the first Saint to lead the team in tackles in three consecutive seasons since Jonathan Vilma (2008-10).

**ZACK BAUN**

• An athletic, sideline to sideline linebacker, possessing the rare combination of pass rush skills and the ability to drop in coverage. After a stellar career at Wisconsin, Baun

played in 15 games in 2020, with three starts at strongside linebacker, posting eight tackles (three solo) and four special teams stops. Overall in his college career, he played in 39 games with 27 starts, all which took place in his final two seasons, recording 154 tackles, 30.5 stops for loss, 15 sacks, two interceptions and three forced fumbles.

• Baun's strength and knowledge of the defense, which was on display when he led the team with five solo tackles in the season opening win vs. Green Bay.

• With Kwon Alexander missing the Week 16 contest vs. Miami due to COVID-19 protocols, Baun stepped into his place at weakside and tied a career-high with seven tackles (career-high tying five solo) and added one solo stop.

**KADEN ELLISS**

• Elliss was selected by the Saints with their second of two seventh round draft choices (244th overall) in 2019 out of Idaho. Elliss is a strong, athletic player with coverage, pass rush and run-stopping abilities who bounced back after missing the majority of 2019 (knee). In 2020, he appeared in 15 regular season games and two postseason contests on special teams recording five stops. The son of former NFL standout Luther Elliss, has utilized his strength, speed and size on defense and special teams. Elliss finished his third campaign with 13 stops, four special teams stops, one sack and one fumble recovery in 13 games.

**PETE WERNER**

• New Orleans selected this three-year starter from Ohio State in the second round of the 2021 NFL Draft. The Indianapolis native finished his college career playing in 47 career games with 35 starts, recording 185 tackles (111 solo), 16 stops for loss, four sacks, 11 passes defended, four forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Werner helped power the Buckeyes to the College Football Playoff championship game as a senior in 2020, when he was voted by Big Ten coaches as a first-team All-Conference selection and a Butkus Award semifinalist, posting 54 tackles, 2.5 stops for loss, one sack and two forced fumbles. Werner made his second career start Oct. 3 vs. the Giants and recorded a ten tackles. With 13 stops in Week Five at Washington, he became the first Saints rookie defender to reach double-digit totals in back-to-back games. He ranked fifth on the team with 59 tackles.

• Werner led the Saints with 12 stops (career-high 11), one stop for loss, one forced fumble and one special teams tackle in the season-opening win at Atlanta, where he proved to be a force on the outside for the Black and Gold. With eight stops and a pass defense in Week 2 vs. Tampa Bay, Werner leads the team with 20 total tackles through the first two weeks.

## SECONDARY

### S TYRANN MATHIEU

• This versatile, hard-hitting, playmaking safety and New Orleans native returned home, signing after the 2022 NFL Draft and will bring extensive experience to the Saints secondary. Mathieu was originally selected by the Arizona Cardinals in the third round (69th overall) in the 2013 NFL Draft out of LSU and has played for the Cardinals (2013-17), Houston Texans (2018), Kansas City Chiefs (2019-21) and Saints. In ten NFL seasons, he has played in 131 regular season games with 122 starts and has posted career totals of 615 tackles (527 solo), 41 stops for loss, ten sacks for a loss of 78 yards, 26 interceptions for 335 returns yards, three brought back for touchdowns, 82 passes defended, four forced fumbles, seven fumble recoveries and five special teams stops. Mathieu has been selected to three Pro Bowls, three *Associated Press* All-Pro teams and the Pro Football Hall of Fame's 2010's All-Decade Team.

## NOSE FOR THE BALL

Saints safety Tyrann Mathieu comes to New Orleans after starting all 16 games he played in for Kansas City in 2021 and recording 76 tackles, one sack, a career-high three fumble recoveries, one sack and two interceptions to earn his second consecutive Pro Bowl selection. With the two picks in 2021, Mathieu's interception total since he entered the NFL in 2013 is tied for fifth over that span.

### CB MARSHON LATTIMORE

• Selected by the Saints in the first round (11<sup>th</sup> overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft, Lattimore started all 13 games he appeared in. He totaled 53 tackles (44 solo), a forced fumble,

one fumble recovery, five interceptions for 85 yards and 18 passes defended, as he became the youngest Saint (21 years old) ever selected to the Pro Bowl and was selected as the AP NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year.

• In 2018, Lattimore opened all 16 contests and posted a career-high 59 tackles (49 solo), two interceptions, 12 passes defended, a club-best four forced fumbles, tied for fourth in the NFL and three fumble recoveries, returned for 91 yards, leading the team in takeaways and tied for the NFL lead in defensive fumble recoveries, the highest total among defensive backs. Lattimore also added two picks in the NFC Divisional Playoff win over Philadelphia.

• A standout 2019 campaign by Lattimore resulted in him being voted to the Pro Bowl, the only Saints cornerback to ever be selected multiple times. Lattimore started all 14 games he played in and posted 57 stops, one interception and ranked first on the team with 14 passes defended.

• In 2020, he posted a career-high 62 tackles (52 solo), two interceptions and 11 passes defended as he was voted to the Pro Bowl for the third time. High expectations follow in 2021 as he signed a long-term contract extension to lock up the lockdown corner in the New Orleans secondary.

• After signing a contract extension at the start of the season, Lattimore posted 68 stops, three picks, a career-high 19 passes defended, ranked third in the NFL and one fumble recovery, being selected to his fourth Pro Bowl.

• In the September 26 28-13 win at New England, Lattimore picked off Patriots QB Mac Jones in the game's next to last play to seal the victory.

• In the Week Five win over Washington, Lattimore earned NFC Defensive Player of the Week honors, as he recorded a career-high six passes defended, the first time that occurred in the NFL since 2017 and tied for the second-highest total in the league since the 1992 season.

• In Week 13 vs. Dallas, Lattimore, posted eight tackles (five solo), a fourth quarter interceptions and a game-high three passes defended.

• In the Week 14 win at the New York Jets, Lattimore, recorded a game-high two passes defended and five tackles, as New York's longest reception in the contest went for only 27 yards.

• In the Week 15 9-0 win at Tampa Bay posted four solo tackles, two passes defended and his first fumble recovery of the season.

• Marcus Maye joined the Saints as an unrestricted free agent in 2022, looking to solidify the safety position alongside Mathieu. Maye, entering his sixth NFL season, first entered the league as a second round draft pick (39th overall) of the New York Jets out of the University of Florida in 2017. He has started all 62 contests he has appeared in for

the Jets and Saints, posting career totals of 321 tackles (227 solo), 3.5 sacks for a loss of 19 yards, six interception returns for 148 yards, 24 passes defended, five forced fumbles, one fumble recovery and four special teams stops.

• In his Black and Gold debut the hard-hitting Maye posted nine tackles (career-high eight solo) and a first half forced fumble in the season-opening victory at Atlanta.

### CB PAULSON ADEBO

• New Orleans' third round selection (76th overall) in the 2021 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Adebo overcame not playing college football in 2020 to make significant contributions to the Saints secondary in his first season with the club. The Texas native finished his college career playing in 22 games with 21 starts for Stanford and recording 97 tackles, 34 passes defended and eight interceptions, earning All-Pac 12 honors in both 2018 and 2019.

• Adebo showed his development by opening opposite Lattimore in the 2021 regular season opening win vs. Green Bay and returning a pick 33 yards in the third quarter to become the first Saints defender to have an interception in his NFL debut since LB James Allen vs. Tampa Bay on September 8, 2002. He then added a second pick in the Week Five win at Washington. With a pick in the regular season finale at Atlanta, Adebo finished his rookie campaign ranked fifth on the club with 63 tackles (54 solo), tied for first with three picks and added eight passes defended and two special teams stops.

### P.J. WILLIAMS

• A third round pick of the Saints in 2015 out of Florida State, Williams has appeared in 79 regular season games with 31 starts for New Orleans, posting 210 tackles, four sacks, eight interception returns for 168 yards with two touchdowns, 49 passes defended, three forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. In 2021, playing a hybrid role of both cornerback and safety, Williams tied for the team lead with three picks for 86 yards returned including a game-clinching 40-yard interception return for a touchdown on October 31 vs. Tampa Bay, while playing outside cornerback, nickel cornerback, strong safety or free safety. In 2022, Williams has contributed in multiple roles and on special teams, recording three solo tackles through the first two contests.

- The Saints lost a 20-10 decision to the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in their 2022 home opener.
- The loss moves New Orleans to 1-1 on the season. The loss also snaps a four-game winning streak overall and in home openers, while ending the Saints seven-game winning streak in regular season games against the Bucs.
- New Orleans will return to action on Sunday at the Carolina Panthers. Kickoff at Bank of America Stadium is 12 p.m. CT with the game regionally televised on FOX (WVUE FOX 8)
- New Orleans have played 323 regular consecutive games without being shut out.
- The Saints totaled 308 yards of offense, carrying 20 times for 102 yards (5.1 avg.) and gaining 206 yards through the air on 40 throws.
- New Orleans allowed 260 total net yards, including surrendering 72 rushing yards on 30 carries (2.4 avg.).
- Saints QB **Jameis Winston** completed 25-of-46 passes for 236 yards with one touchdown and three interceptions.
- RB **Mark Ingram II** reached 10,000 career total yards from scrimmage with an eight-yard run in the second quarter, meaning he is the 108th player in NFL history to reach that milestone.
- Ingram II led the New Orleans backfield with 60 rushing yards on 10 carries (6.0 avg.) and had two receptions for three yards.
- WR **Chris Olave** led the team with season-highs of 80 yards on five receptions. Olave was credited with a career-long 51-yard reception in the fourth quarter but fumbled the ball on the play and Tampa Bay recovered.
- WR **Michael Thomas** led the Saints with six receptions and turned in 65 yards and one touchdown.
- Saints TE **Juwan Johnson** logged a career-high four receptions and tallied 40 yards. WR **Jarvis Landry** matched Johnson's four receptions for 25 yards.
- LB **Pete Werner** led the defense with six tackles
- DT **Shy Tuttle** and DT **David Onyemata** shared New Orleans' lone sack of the game. Tuttle led the team with nine tackles.
- Winston connected with Michael Thomas for a seven-yard touchdown, making the score 20-10 with 3:03 left in the game. The lone touchdown for the Saints capped a drive of nine plays and 75 yards in 1:09.
- The Saints went into the locker room at halftime with a 3-0 lead. The Saints defense had held the Buccaneers scoreless for six consecutive quarters dating back to the 9-0 victory at Raymond James Stadium on Dec. 19, 2021.
- The Saints defense came up with the game's first turnover on the opening drive when Buccaneers' Brady fumbled the snap on the Saints 25-yard line on third-and-one. Saints LB **Demario Davis** recovered the fumble. Davis finished with six tackles and one pass defended in addition to the recovery.
- LB **Pete Werner** finished with eight tackles, to extend his team-high total on the season to 20.
- WR/RS **Deonte Harty** returned two kickoffs for 65 yards.
- LB **Kaden Elliss**, FB **Adam Prentice** and LB **Zack Baun** each had one special teams tackle.

(On Marshon Lattimore being disqualified): “He (Mike Evans) was the first one to push and shove Lattimore, but I’ve been around this league long enough; usually they don’t get the instigator, they usually get the responder. I think what happened after that was a little bit excessive so we will see how that goes.”

(On his thoughts if Jameis Winston’s back was bothering him and affecting his play): “No I didn’t really see that, necessarily. Again, that is probably a question for him a little bit more. That is a good defense that we played. They do a pretty good job in terms of their rush coverage and some of their pressure packages, so we will get back and look at the tape and see where we can improve. There are a couple of throws we missed that he typically wouldn’t. We will have to evaluate the tape and see.”

(On his plan for Jameis before the game if there was any question of him not being able to play) “No, he was going.”

(On late third quarter fumble): “That was a game changer I think the ball was on the ten-yard line at that point in time and we were in a good position with how we were playing defense that if we were able to put some points on the board; I think there was a minute to go in the third quarter when that happened so I thought that was a momentum changer in the game.”

(On if the disqualification was the factor of the momentum change): “I don’t think that was a factor. I mean we lost momentum and we lost momentum because we turned the ball over. I don’t think that was the factor.”

(On the decision to not kick a field goal before the half): “Look, we knew this was going to be a field position game, which it was. Unfortunately, we played the game on our end of the field a little bit too much the first half, but it was a three to nothing game at that point in time and I didn’t feel like taking an opportunity on a long field goal at that point in the game was the right thing to do.”

(On how his back feels): "It feels like my back."

(On how his back felt going into the game): "What's the most important thing is like our team hauled our tail off. Defense played a great game. Offensively, we just got to give it on third downs and protect the football. For myself I have to get better on third downs and protect the football."

(On the offensive performance): "Like I said, we have to get better on third downs and that's on me. We had a great chance in the redzone to end up with seven and not three, and I missed Chris (Olave). We just got to continue to get better."

(On the offensive struggles the past two games) "Early, early. I think we are going to get better. You know, we had some momentum here early in the third quarter. The biggest thing is ball security. I think we still had a chance to get in this game. They won the turnover battle and that's why they won."

(On whether Tampa's defense was different than previously) "No. We were prepared. It's just on me. I have to take what the defense is giving me and keep the ball in our possession because when we keep the ball in our possession a lot of good things can happen."

(On the missed connections with Chris Olave): "I missed him. Man, I just got to hit it, I got to hit it. When you have opportunities like that, you got to hit them. Especially in this league, this game is a game of inches. Chris did a great job of creating separation and getting open, but I get better. Those are going to be touchdowns real soon."

(On his back, if it impacted his play, and how it could affect him moving forward): "Yeah, what's really important is protecting the football. I have to do I have to do a better job of doing that to give ourselves a chance to win the game."

(On the extent of the injury): "Yeah, you know, everyone in the locker room was playing with some type of banged up or something. But like I said, what's important is offensively I have to do a better job of executing third downs, and I can't give them the football."

(On his various previous injuries leading to this one): "My main thing is focusing on execution. I didn't execute. Like two weeks in a row where we were (around) 4 for 13 on third downs, and that's on me. It's just this time I turned over the football. So we're going to get back to the drawing board and I'm going to protect the football. That's the big thing."

(On Marshon Lattimore getting ejected): "I don't. I don't think he should have at all. But these referees get put in a tough position. Everyone from New York, they have to make that call. But I think he bit the bullet. He made a huge sacrifice for his team because it was not on him. But when the emotions get to flaring, they're humans. The referees are humans and they've got to make a decision."

(On the contentiousness of this game having been on both sides of the rivalry): "I mean, I think we're just two good football teams. And the big thing is it's early in the season. I hate to drop a division game like that. We just got to bounce back. Defense played a heck of a game, they did phenomenal. We had some good things on offense too. But my focus is on eliminating the negatives and building on the positives. Because there's some positives there."

(On finding a sustained rhythm): "I think it just starts with me. We got to just get completions early. It was some opportunities out there that would have really set this game apart, some big plays down the field to Chris that we fell short on. I think that is just it. We are going to just keep hitting the drawing boards, keep on building the chemistry of this offense. We got great playmakers, we just have to execute."

(On Chris's plays that maybe weren't called): "This game, this game is the game of inches. You know, sometimes it ends up in your favor, sometimes it doesn't. But they're gonna start ending up in our favor."

(On the fight and Lattimore being ejected from the game): “Obviously, he is one of the better cornerbacks in this league. For the majority of the game, guys weren’t able to catch balls on him. I think that’s a tactic that guys will use playing against him to get him out of his game. I think in that moment we all kind of have to respond.”

(On how the defense played) “I thought we played really well. I mean obviously you always want a few plays back. Anytime you play this quarterback you have to put him away early or he’ll find a way to make one of those types of plays.

(On the defense coming together after the Lattimore ejection) “I thought we bonded well. I feel like we have a deep DB unit. It was good to see Alontae (Taylor) come into the game and hold his own. P.J. (Williams) can play multiple positions. That’s what we are going to need.”

#### **RB Mark Ingram II**

(On the fumble) “I have to take protect the football at all costs. We were going in to take control of the game. That was the turning point. I had the ball high and tight and I think it was a punch. Whatever the circumstance is, whatever the situation. I have to protect the football. That’s my job. It’s something that I take pride in, but I’m accountable. I have to do better. We were going in to take control of the game and that can’t happen.”

(On if there was a change after the fumble) “I don’t think there was a noticeable change on the sideline. I think everyone was still in tune. The defense went out and got a stop. Essentially, they didn’t get points off that turnover, but we took points off the board by having the turnover. I think it was a turning point. We started having turnovers. We started having penalties. We started having plays that are uncharacteristic of us.”

(On moving the ball but not scoring and the frustration level) “Obviously, we are frustrated. We know what we are capable of doing. We have to do a better job of all the small details and making sure Jameis (Winston) is protected and making sure we can get the ball downfield to our receivers. We have to improve and continue to detail all of that stuff, so we can transfer it to the game.”

#### **WR Michael Thomas**

(On if he felt Jameis was 100% with the back problem) “I was just focused on getting my job done and being where they wanted me to be and executing the game plan. I’m sure when we watch the film we will see if there is anything like that going on, but I was focused on my assignment”

(On the Tampa Bay defense) “They are a sneaky defense.”

(On the chippiness going to a different level) “That’s a little bit out of control what those guys are doing. It’s hard not to react like Marshon does when you are getting pushed in the back. That’s reactionary. You are trying to protect yourself. That’s not tough. That’s not cool. Whatever you want to call it. It’s getting old. We can’t allow that to hurt us as a team. We have to find a way to lock in and stay disciplined.”

#### **DE Cameron Jordan**

(On how Lattimore’s absence affected the defense) “I think we went out there and had another three and out. I think the series after that we were headed toward another three and out and then there was a random penalty that was made up on a tackle that was missed. Again, we have to fight everything and play a complete sixty minutes. We are not going to be satisfied. Clearly, if you don’t play sixty minutes, then this is what happens. I think defensively there was a game plan put together and that first half showed what we were executing. You can talk about the fourth and one stops and the three and outs that happened. When you feel like you are the better team and you look up and we have five turnovers, then that’s tough to come back from.”

(On having Tom Brady under control) “He was exactly who we thought he was. He gets the ball out fast. He doesn’t allow you to hit him. He doesn’t let you get that extra pass rusher to rush the passer.

We talked about eliminating the run this week. That was our emphasis and our focus. I'm not sure what their average was per carry."

(On Mike Evan's ejection and the altercation): "I didn't see the whole thing. I just saw a lot of pushing and shoving and flags flying. The next thing I know, everybody was storming the field. We lost a good player. They lost a good player. It was a physical ballgame."

(On if the fight was a turning point for the Buccaneers' offense): "I don't know if it was a turning point. We were into the ballgame. It was 3-3 at that point. It could have went either way. We had to make some plays. (Jamel) Dean came up big twice. Mike (Edwards) came up big. We got a fumble at the end, so I guess that was the turning point. We were into the game, and at the time we were getting down to the fourth quarter. We were trying to make a play."

(On the status of Josh Wells' calf): "Not yet. They're going to run some tests on it, and they will let us know."

(On how close Donovan Smith was to playing): "He didn't practice all week, so we kind of got a feeling in the week that he wasn't going to play."

(On Smith's possibility of playing next week): "I'm not sure. Too early to tell."

(On Tampa Bay's defensive effort): "We shouldn't have given up that (touchdown). We had 3  $\frac{3}{4}$  quarters worth of good work, and we lapsed at the end. We have to learn how to finish out ballgames."

(On being down three receivers and Breshad Perriman's play): "That's why we kept him. He can do everything, and he comes up big at the right time. He can block for us. He plays special teams, and he knows all of the receivers' spots. He's got experience. He proved his worth today."

(On what was working well on the Perriman touchdown): "We gave Tom (Brady) a little time. He made a great throw. Breshad (Perriman) made a great play. They were playing pretty good defense on us as well. Yards were hard to come by, and points were hard to come by in that ballgame. We were just lucky we got one."

(On the Saints defense): "They're bigger up front than Dallas, but they're a good defense. We know they have a good defensive team. Question: From your perspective, what did you see that led to the disqualification of Marshon Lattimore and Mike Evans?

Anderson: "The officials had flags for both of those players. So, we actually reviewed those actions and determined that the actions by both of those players did rise to the level of flagrant and then therefore disqualification."

Question: Why was Leonard Fournette, who instigated this, not penalized? Were you able to talk to the officials about this?

Anderson: "Rule 19 allows us to end up looking at the potential for other players to be disqualified. We just did not feel like those actions rose to the level of disqualification."

Question: Specifically, if you can, can you comment on what these players did that rose to the level of disqualification and flagrant fouls?

Anderson: "They were involved in the altercation. League policy advises players that coming to the defense or assistance of your fighting teammates does not excuse you for entering the area. So those actions, as well as the physical actions that both players engaged in. We just felt they were flagrant and rose to the level of disqualification."
