**THE MATCHUP**

The New Orleans Saints (10-1), who are in the midst of only their second winning streak of at least ten games in franchise history will start a three-game road trip with a visit to Arlington, Texas to face the Dallas Cowboys (6-5) on Thursday night. The prime time contest will feature two of the NFL's hottest teams in the Saints and Cowboys, who have won their last three games to catapult into a first-place tie in the NFC East with Washington.

Both clubs will be playing with a typical six days of rest following Thanksgiving victories. New Orleans is coming off a hard-fought, 31-17 divisional victory over Atlanta Thursday night that featured an efficient offensive performance and a hard-hitting defensive showing that displayed an increasing nose for the ball with a season-high four takeaways. Despite the margin of victory, the Saints weren't able to feel comfortable until CB **Marshon Lattimore** stripped the ball from Falcons WR **Calvin Ridley** at the New Orleans three-yard line late in the fourth quarter and the ball was recovered by CB **Eli Apple**. The Cowboys are coming off a 31-23 home win over Washington in their annual Thanksgiving tilt that gave them a crucial tiebreaking victory in their divisional race.

Dallas leads the 28-game series, 16-12, though New Orleans has posted a 9-2 mark since 1998. New Orleans has a 2-1 edge in contests played at AT&T Stadium.

On Thanksgiving night at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome, New Orleans kept the defensive pressure on the Falcons, while some key contributors on offense stepped up. Three of New Orleans' takeaways took place in the red zone

New Orleans marched down the field to score a touchdown on their possession when QB **Drew Brees** connected with WR **Tommy Lee Lewis** on a 28-yard touchdown. The Saints defense then saved a potential touchdown when S **Marcus Williams** sacked Falcons QB **Matt Ryan** at the Saints seven-yard line and recovered his fumble.

New Orleans would extend their lead into the second half to a 17-3 halftime edge on a field goal by K **Wil Lutz** and a scoring throw from Brees to WR **Austin Carr**. The Saints defense then saved a potential score prior to the half as LB **Alex Anzalone** stripped Falcons WR **Julio Jones** at the New Orleans 13-yard line and it was recovered by S **Vonn Bell**.

Brees tossed his third touchdown pass of the evening when he found TE **Dan Arnold** in the end zone to extend the lead to 24-3 with 5:59 remaining in the third quarter.

The Falcons scored a touchdown late in the third quarter to move within 14 points and then their defense forced a three-and-out, but LB **A.J. Klein** picked off Ryan and Brees converted it into a five-yard touchdown pass to rookie WR **Keith Kirkwood**.

Brees completed 15-of-22 passes for 171 yards with four touchdown passes, one interception and a 111.9 passer rating. Brees and the Saints became the first team in the Super Bowl era to have four different undrafted players with at least one receiving touchdown in a game (Arnold, Carr, Kirkwood and Lewis). The signal-caller tied National Football League records by throwing touchdown passes to 13 different players in a season and tied the mark with Peyton Manning for his 35th four touchdown performance.

**SERIES HISTORY**

Dallas leads the series, 16-12, though New Orleans has won nine of the last 11 meetings, including a 26-20 overtime win at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome, Oct. 4, 2015 when QB Drew Brees tossed his 400th career touchdown for the win. The Cowboys won 8 of 10 from 1973-1994 and 13 of the first 16 between the clubs. Ten games have been decided by a touchdown or less, five contests by three or less. The Saints have a 2-1 record at AT&T Stadium:

**LAST MEETING**

**Saints 26, Cowboys 20; Oct. 4, 2015 @ Mercedes-Benz Superdome** – The Saints took their first win of the season in overtime against the Cowboys, battling to a 26-20 overtime win that saw the quickest touchdown from scrimmage in a fifth period in NFL history on a pass from QB **Drew Brees** to RB **C.J. Spiller** that resulted in an 80-yard score, also the 400th TD pass of the signal-caller's career.

New Orleans started off slowly as they won the coin toss and elected to receive starting with a three-and out and then allowing a 45-yard rush to Cowboys RB **Lance Dunbar** that set up a 30-yard field goal. New Orleans then started at their 20, where Brees engineered an 11-play, 80-yard drive that ended with a three-yard TD to TE **Josh Hill** that gave the Saints a 7-3 lead. The Cowboys scored again when they got the ball back, resulting in a one-yard TD run by RB **Joseph Randle**. New Orleans still struggled offensively through the middle of the second quarter, as they were forced to punt two more times. but the defense forced Dallas to punt on their last two possessions of the first half, the final powered by a sack by LB **Stephone Anthony**

In the start to the second half, after forcing a three-and-out, New Orleans took advantage of a 12 men on the field penalty on a punt from the Dallas 38 and K **Zach Hocker** drilled a 51-yard field goal to tie the score at 10-10. The Cowboys then drove to the New Orleans nine, but a sack for a loss of 11 yards by rookie LB **Hau'oli Kikaha** forced Dallas to settle for a field goal. When New Orleans got the ball back, Hocker was able to drill a 27-yard field goal to tie the score.

At the start of the fourth quarter, rookie DT **Tyler Davison** sacked Cowboys QB **Brandon Weeden** and forced them to punt, taking the ball at the Saints 33-yard line. Brees then conducted an 11-play, 67-yard drive that was powered by runs of 15– and eight-yards by RB **Mark Ingram** to reach the one, where RB **Khiry Robinson** punched it in for the 20-13 lead. The two clubs then traded punts, but the Cowboys would tie the score on their final drive of regulation when Weeden completed a 17-yard touchdown to WR **Terrence Williams**.

New Orleans advanced to the Cowboys 12-yard line with 16 seconds remaining in regulation on a drive powered by a Brees 30-yard completion to WR **Brandon Coleman**, but a 30-yard field goal attempt by Hocker bounced off the left upright. However, after New Orleans won the coin toss for overtime, Brees helped deliver the victory by hitting Spiller in stride and with the speedy running back beating several Cowboys defenders with the touchdown. The signal-caller finished the contest completing 33-of-41 passes for 359 yards and a 119.4 rating, while Ingram had a game-high 128 total yards from scrimmage.

## THE COACHES

New Orleans Saints Head Coach **Sean Payton** has posted a 122-77 overall record (.613), including a 7-5 postseason mark (.583) after the franchise had won only one playoff game prior to his arrival. Coaching his 200th contest on Thursday night (regular season and postseason combined) against the Dallas Cowboys, Payton holds both the club's top win total and winning percentage. He continues to represent the Saints as the model of stability not only within the NFC South, as he is the longest tenured head coach within the division, but also among the most accomplished within the National Football League. Only the New England Patriots' Bill Belichick (2000), the Cincinnati Bengals' Marvin Lewis (2003) and the Green Bay Packers' Mike McCarthy (hired one week prior to Payton in 2006) have been with their teams longer. Payton is also one of just eight active coaches to lead a team to a Super Bowl victory. The others are Belichick, the Seattle Seahawks' Pete Carroll, the Oakland Raiders' Jon Gruden (Tampa Bay in 2002), the Baltimore Ravens' John Harbaugh, McCarthy, the Philadelphia Eagles' Doug Pederson and the Pittsburgh Steelers' Mike Tomlin. The 2018 Saints edition has posted a 10-1 record and currently sit atop the NFC South through Week 12, tied for the best record in the National Football League. New Orleans' current ten-game winning streak is second-longest in club history and the longest streak in the NFL this season. The streak only sits behind in club record books, New Orleans' 13-0 start under Payton in 2009, the season when they captured Super Bowl XLIV. The 2017 Saints squad yielded an 11-5 regular season record, producing their first playoff berth since 2013, behind a squad led by quarterback Drew Brees offensively and defensive end Cameron Jordan defensively, this team featured seven players selected to the Pro Bowl, tied for the most in club history and four draft picks selected to the *PFWA* All-Rookie Team, two more than any other club. With running back Alvin Kamara and cornerback Marshon Lattimore, the 2017 Saints were the first team to have both the *Associated Press* NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year and Defensive Rookie of the Year since 1967. The Saints defense saw improvement in virtually every major statistical category. New Orleans moved up ten spots in total defense, including from 32nd to 15th against the pass. After ranking 31st in opponent points per game in 2016, New Orleans moved up to tenth in 2017, surrendering only 20.4 points per game. Payton earned a bachelor's degree in communications at Eastern Illinois, where as a quarterback he had 10,665 passing yards, at the time the third-highest total in NCAA Division I-AA history. Payton was inducted into the Eastern Illinois Hall of Fame in September of 2000 and had his jersey retired in a ceremony in September of 2010. He

received an honorary doctorate from his alma mater in 2013. Payton was born December 29, 1963 in San Mateo, Calif., and raised in Naperville, Ill., Payton has a daughter, Meghan and a son, Connor.

**Jason Garrett** was named the eighth head coach in Dallas Cowboys history on January 5, 2011 after handling interim duties in the second half of the 2010 season. Garrett became the first former Cowboys player to become head coach. Garrett has posted a 73-58 record in the regular season and a 1-2 mark in the postseason. As a backup quarterback during his career in Dallas, he started 9-of-23 games played and was a member of teams that won six division titles and three Super Bowls. Garrett took over as interim head coach midway through 2010. He guided the club to a 5-3 mark to finish after the team started 1-7. He led Dallas to three straight 8-8 records, narrowly missing the playoffs and division titles in his first three full seasons as head coach (2011-2013), before posting a 12-4 record and capturing the NFC East title in 2014. In 2016, Garrett led the Cowboys to a 13-3 record and the NFC East title and he currently has Dallas leading their division going into Week 13 with a 6-5 record, currently on a three-game winning streak. Garrett was hired as Cowboys offensive coordinator in 2007, and in 2008, he was assigned the additional duties of assistant head coach. Under Garrett, the offense has reached high levels of productivity in several categories, and the unit has finished among the NFL's top-10 in total offense six times: 2016 (fifth), 2014 (seventh), 2012 (sixth), 2010 (tenth), 2009 (second), and 2007 (second). The team has set single-season records in a handful of categories, including topping 6,000 net yards for the first times in franchise history (2016-6,027, 2014 - 6,138, 2009 - 6,390 and 2011 - 6,008). Garrett entered coaching as the quarterbacks coach (2005-06) for Nick Saban's first Miami Dolphins club. He played at Princeton (1987-88) for two seasons and was named the Ivy League's Player of the Year as a senior. Garrett played professionally for 15 years, first joining the Saints practice squad and then in the World League and the Canadian Football League before joining Dallas (1992-99), where he served as the backup to Troy Aikman and was a member of three Super Bowl Championship teams, the New York Giants (2000-02), the Tampa Bay Buccaneers (2004) and Dolphins (2004).

Johnson and Cowboys Offensive Coordinator **Scott Linehan** were college teammates at Idaho. Linehan, Dallas Assistant Wide Receivers Coach **Kyle Valero** and Saints Special Teams Coordinator **Bradford Banta** served on the same Detroit staff from 2009-13. Banta served on Cowboys Defensive Coordinator/Defensive Line Coach **Rod Marinelli**'s staff in Detroit in 2008. New Orleans Assistant Special Teams Coach **Kevin O'Dea** and Marinelli served on the same Chicago staff from 2011-12 and in Tampa Bay from 1996-99...Dallas Safeties Coach **Greg Jackson** played at Louisiana State University from 1985-88, played for the Saints and served as an assistant coach at Tulane from 2007-09 and at Louisiana-Monroe from 2004-06. Jackson and Saints Assistant Wide Receivers Coach **Ronald Curry** and Jackson served on the same 49ers coaching staff from 2013-14...Dallas Director of Advance Scouting and Special Projects **Judd Garrett** served on the Saints coaching staff from 1997-99...Dallas Tight Ends Coach **Doug Nussmeier** played quarterback for the Saints from 1994-97...New Orleans Linebackers Coach **Mike Nolan**'s father, Dick, played for the Cowboys in 1962, then served as their defensive coordinator for six seasons. ### FEDEX AIR PLAYER OF THE WEEK NFC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK WEEK 3: QB DREW BREES

**New Orleans Saints 43, Atlanta Falcons 37 @ Mercedes-Benz Stadium, Sept. 23, 2018**

Completed 39-of-49 passes for 396 yards, two touchdowns and two rushing touchdowns tying his single-game career high. Became the only player to have 350 passing yards, three touchdown passes, two rushing touchdowns and zero interceptions in a contest. With 396 yards passing, Brees recorded his 104th 300-yard game as a Saint, 111<sup>th</sup> overall. With his career-high tying 39 completions, Brees surpassed Brett Favre (6,300) and is now the NFL's all-time leader in completions.

### NFC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK WEEK 4: LB DEMARIO DAVIS

**New Orleans Saints 33, New York Giants 18 @ MetLife Stadium, Sept. 30, 2018**

Recorded a team-high 11 tackles (nine solo), his highest total and solo total as a Saint so far and tied a career-high with two sacks for loss of 17 yards.

### NFC SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE MONTH SEPTEMBER: K WIL LUTZ

Lutz drilled 10-of-11 field goals, all 11 PAT attempts and had 17 of his kickoffs sail into the end zone for touchbacks as he led the NFL in scoring (41 points) through Week Four. Lutz has made his last eight field goal attempts.

**New Orleans Saints 33, New York Giants 18 @ MetLife Stadium, Sept. 30, 2018**

## GAME SUMMARIES

**WEEK 1: Tampa Bay Buccaneers 48, Saints 40; September 9, 2018 @ Mercedes-Benz Superdome** – The Saints' 2018 regular season got off to a disappointing start as the Tampa Bay Buccaneers took a 48-40 victory at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome.

Trailing by 24 points in the fourth quarter, the Saints rallied behind two **Alvin Kamara** touchdowns, a one-yard run and a seven-yard pass from QB **Drew Brees**. The Saints converted two-point plays on both touchdowns. But Tampa was able to run out the clock to claim the road victory.

**Ryan Fitzpatrick**, filling in for suspended starting QB **Jameis Winston**, had one of the most productive games of his career, passing for 417 yards and four touchdowns while rushing for another. WRs **Mike Evans** (seven catches for 147 yards, one touchdown) and **DeSean Jackson** (five catches for 146 yards, two touchdowns) did the most damage as the Saints defense didn't force its first punt until 7:42 was remaining in the third quarter.

The Saints offense kept up for the first half - scoring 24 points - but sputtered at the start of the second half with two punts and a lost fumble (WR **Michael Thomas**) on the first three possessions. In the first half Bucs returned RB **Mike Gillislee**'s fumble 34 yards for a score.

Thomas' fumble was the lone miscue in a record-setting performance as the third-year receiver from Ohio State had 16 catches for 180 yards and one six-yard touchdown. He set the team's single-game receptions record and was the highest receptions total on NFL kickoff weekend all-time. It was his fourth 100-yard game and he moved past 200 career receptions.

The Bucs finished with 529 yards of offense while the Saints had 475.

**WEEK 2: Saints 21, Cleveland Browns 18; September 16, 2018 @ Mercedes-Benz Superdome** – The New Orleans Saints earned their first win of the 2018 campaign with a 21-18 come-from-behind victory over Cleveland at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome in what would be the start of a winning streak that has extended to ten games.

After the two clubs traded field goals in the first quarter, Cleveland K **Zane Gonzalez** kicked a 39-yard field goal with 1:55 left in the second quarter to give the Browns a 6-3 lead going into halftime.

To open up the second half, the Cleveland defense forced a three-and-out. Browns QB **Tyrod Taylor** then led them on a 12-play, 79-yard drive that ended with a one-yard touchdown run by RB **Carlos Hyde** to take a 12-3 lead following a missed extra point attempt.

New Orleans' offensive struggles continued as a promising

drive that had the Saints at third-and-one at the Cleveland 40-yard line was derailed when Brees was sacked by **Larry Ogunjobi** for a ten-yard loss to be forced to punt.

Cleveland advanced to the New Orleans 26-yard line on the subsequent drive that entered into the fourth quarter, but a 44-yard field goal attempt by Gonzalez went wide left. The Saints got the ball back at their 34-yard line and Brees engineered a nine-play, 66-yard drive that ended with a two-yard touchdown pass to WR **Michael Thomas** that put the Saints within two. The two clubs then traded three-and-outs, but S **Marcus Williams** picked off Taylor at the Cleveland 40-yard line and returned it 22 yards to the 18-yard line. Four plays later, Brees connected with Thomas for a five-yard touchdown with a successful two-point conversion rush by RB **Alvin Kamara** to give the Saints an 18-12 lead. The Browns answered when Taylor connected with WR **Andrew Callaway** on a 47-yard touchdown, but Gonzalez's extra point attempt went wide left. Brees and the Saints got the ball back and he led them down the field to set up a game-winning **Wil Lutz** 44-yard field goal with 21 seconds left.

**WEEK 3: Saints 43, Atlanta Falcons 37; September 23, 2018 @ Mercedes-Benz Stadium** – The Saints improved to 2-1 with this overtime victory at Atlanta, with QB **Drew Brees** becoming the NFL's completions leader, passing for 396 yards and tossing three touchdowns and running for two more, one a fourth quarter seven-yard rush in the fourth quarter, the second a dramatic quarterback sneak to end overtime. RB **Alvin Kamara** and WR **Michael Thomas** also had monster performances, backed by a stout offensive line, DE **Cameron Jordan** had two sacks and special teams made a significant contribution with a blocked punt. The win would be the first of what would end up being a season sweep for New Orleans.

With their first offensive drive at their 25-yard line to start, the Saints marched 75 yards in six plays, with Brees connecting with WR **Ted Ginn Jr.** on a four-yard touchdown pass. Atlanta responded on their second possession of the contest with an 18-yard touchdown connection from QB **Matt Ryan** to WR **Calvin Ridley**.

K **Wil Lutz** booted a pair of second quarter field goals, but Ryan gave Atlanta a 14-13 lead when he connected with Ridley on a 75-yard touchdown. But New Orleans took advantage of a late possession at their 42 and Brees completed quick throws to Kamara and TE **Benjamin Watson** to set up a 45-yard Lutz field goal to give New Orleans a 16-14 lead at halftime.

Atlanta got the ball coming out of the half and they took the lead back on a nine-yard touchdown connection between Ryan and Ridley. Midway through the third quarter, DE **Alex Okafor** blocked a punt by Falcons P **Matt Bosher** and LB **Craig Robertson** recovered the ball at the Falcons 16-yard line. Four plays later, Brees completed an 11-yard touchdown to WR **Cameron Meredith**.

Three plays into the final quarter, RB **Tevin Coleman** capped a 12-play, 82-yard drive with a five-yard TD reception followed by a successful two-point conversion to give the Falcons a six-point lead. But the Saints put together a lengthy drive, with Brees finding FB **Zach Line** for a one-yard touchdown. Ryan's five-yard touchdown pass to WR **Mohamed Sanu** and a two-point conversion gave Atlanta a seven-point lead, but the Saints marched 81 yards in 11 plays and Brees had a seven-yard rush for a touchdown to tie the score.

New Orleans took the opening kickoff of overtime and drove 80 yards, the game ending with the one-yard quarterback sneak by Brees.

Thomas had ten receptions for 129 yards. Kamara had a career-high 190 total yards from scrimmage with 16 carries for 66 yards and a career-best 15 receptions for 124 yards. Adding in 16 punt return yards, the workhorse on offense and special teams finished with 206 all-purpose yards. Jordan led an inspired effort by the defense with two sacks.

**WEEK 4: Saints 33, New York Giants 18; September 30, 2018 @ MetLife Stadium** – The Saints posted an impressive victory against the Giants behind a powerful running game and an outstanding run-stopping effort.

The Giants scored on their first offensive drive, taking a 7-0 lead on a two-yard touchdown connection between QB **Eli Manning** and WR **Sterling Shepard**.

When the Saints got the ball back, QB **Drew Brees** engineered a 15-play, 51-yard drive that ended with a **Wil Lutz** 42-yard field goal on the first play of the second quarter, the first of four successful kicks in the quarter to give the Saints a 12-7 halftime lead. The Saints defense then proceeded to clamp down on the Giants offense as they allowed only 65 rushing yards, fumbles were forced by DT **Tyler Davison** and CB **P.J. Williams** and recovered by CB **Marshon Lattimore** and DL **Taylor Stallworth**, while Manning was sacked three times, the defense allowing him to average only 5.3 yards per attempt.

QB **Drew Brees** completed 18 of 32 passes for 217 yards as the Saints ran up 170 yards on the ground. RB **Alvin Kamara** carried 19 times for a career-high 134 yards (7.1 avg) and three touchdowns. In the passing game, Kamara also led the team in receiving with five grabs for 47 yards, for a game-high total of 181 total yards from scrimmage. TE **Josh Hill** added three receptions for a team-high 63 yards.

LB **Demario Davis** led the New Orleans pass rush with two sacks and added a team-high 11 tackles, while Davison added a quarterback takedown and forced fumble in the fourth quarter. Lattimore's fumble return was for 37 yards as New Orleans finished +2 in turnover ratio, not giving away the football.

• The Saints held the Giants to 299 net yards, the first time this season they have held an opponent to under 300

yards. Surrendering only 44 yards rushing to Giants RB **Saquon Barkley**, New Orleans has not allowed an opposing running back to reach the century mark for their last ten regular season games.

• With a career-high 134 yards rushing and 181 total yards from scrimmage, Graham had the third back-to-back 180-yard games by a New Orleans player, joining RBs **Rueben Mayes** (1986-two straight) and **Deuce McAllister** (2003-three straight).

• Davis' two sacks were the second time in his seven-year career that he has posted more than one quarterback takedown, but his first as a Saint.

• The victory improved New Orleans' all-time record vs. New York to 14-16, giving the Saints their first win at MetLife Stadium.

**WEEK 5: Saints 43, Washington Redskins 19; October 8, 2018 @ Mercedes-Benz Superdome** – The Saints won their fourth consecutive game in a standout Monday night performance on offense and defense, which saw QB **Drew Brees** become the NFL's all-time passing yardage leader.

The Saints first jumped out to a 6-0 first quarter lead on their first drive of the contest when RB **Mark Ingram** had a two-yard rushing touchdown. Carolina got on the board when K **Dustin Hopkins** drilled a 37-yard field goal at the end of the first quarter.

The Saints jumped out to a commanding 26-6 lead when Ingram rushed for a one-yard touchdown and Brees and Smith connected on the record-setting touchdown with 2:36 left in the second quarter. The Redskins cut the halftime deficit to 26-13 when they converted a fumble by wide receiver **Cameron Meredith** into a four-yard touchdown run by quarterback **Alex Smith**.

Getting the ball first at the start of the second half, Brees connected with Smith on a 35-yard touchdown. Smith was then picked off by Saints DB **Justin Hardee**, seeing the first regular season defensive action of his two-year NFL career and the interception was returned 77 yards to set up a one-yard touchdown run by QB **Taysom Hill** to extend New Orleans' lead to 40-13. A third quarter Washington fumble set up a 44-yard field goal by K **Wil Lutz**.

Brees completed 26-of-28 passes for 363 yards with three touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 153.2 passer rating as his 89.7 completion percentage set a career-high. Smith finished with three receptions for a game-high 111 yards.

• S **Vonn Bell** led the Saints with eight tackles (seven solo) and one pass defended, while DEs **Marcus Davenport** and **Cameron Jordan** and DT **Sheldon Rankins** each recorded sacks with Davenport forcing a fumble.

• Smith's 62-yard reception on the record-setting play from Brees was the longest catch by a Saints rookie since a 76-yard scoring grab by wide receiver **Kenny Stills** in 2013.

• After recording a sack in the contest, Smith became the 27th quarterback that Jordan has dropped in the regular season in his eight-year career.

- The victory improved New Orleans' all-time record vs. Washington to 10-17, giving the Saints back-to-back home wins over the Redskins for the first time.

**WEEK 7: Saints 24, Baltimore Ravens 23; October 21, 2018 @ M&T Bank Stadium** – QB **Drew Brees** helped New Orleans rebound from a 17-7 fourth quarter deficit as he led the Saints on three drives that produced 17 points including two touchdowns against a Baltimore defense that hadn't allowed an opponent into the end zone in the second half all season.

Brees completed 22-of-30 passes for 212 yards with two touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 114.9 passer rating as his second quarter one-yard touchdown pass to TE **Benjamin Watson** marked his 500th career scoring throw. With the win, Brees has now defeated all 32 NFL teams, becoming the third signal-caller to do so and Head Coach **Sean Payton** has defeated all 31 opponents. WR **Michael Thomas** led New Orleans in receiving with seven grabs for 69 yards, including a fourth quarter five-yard touchdown grab to put New Orleans up 21-17.

- LB **A.J. Klein** sparked with a team-high seven tackles as he led a run-stopping effort that gave up only 77 yards rushing and surrendered only a 3.3 yards per carry clip.

**WEEK 8: Saints 30, Minnesota Vikings 20; October 28, 2018 @ U.S. Bank Stadium** – The New Orleans Saints improved to 6-1 after defeating the Minnesota Vikings in Minnesota on Sunday Night Football by a score of 30-20. New Orleans jumped out to a 7-0 lead after QB **Drew Brees** found RB **Alvin Kamara** in the first quarter on a three-yard pass, which was then matched by the Vikings when QB **Kirk Cousins** completed a one-yard TD to WR **Stefon Diggs**.

Early in the second quarter, the Vikings took a 13-7 lead on a one-yard run by RB **Latavius Murray** followed up by a failed extra point. K **Will Lutz** then connected on a 52-yard field goal to put New Orleans within three. With 1:11 left in the first half, LB **Alex Anzalone** caused a fumble by the Vikings' **Adam Thielen** that was returned by CB **Marshon Lattimore** 53 yards. Kamara punched in a one-yard TD two plays later that gave the Saints a 17-13 halftime lead..

Lutz made his second field goal early in the third to bring the score to 20-13 and on Minnesota's next possession the lead was extended to 27-13 on a 45-yard interception return for a touchdown by CB **P.J. Williams**, which would earn him NFC Defensive Player of the Week honors.

In the fourth quarter, Lutz drilled a second 42-yard kick. Minnesota made a TD drive late while the Saints defense had switched to a prevent mode to set up a final score of 30-20.

- QB **Drew Brees** threw a first half interception, which was his first pick after he went 264 regular season pass attempts over a nine-game period without one.

**WEEK 9: Saints 45, Los Angeles Rams 35; November 4, 2018 @ Mercedes-Benz Superdome** – Despite a furious second half rally by the Rams, where they came back from an 18-point halftime deficit and tied the score at 35 apiece early in the fourth quarter, the Saints scored the last ten points of the contest as the improved to 7-1 and extended their winning streak to seven contests.

The Saints took charge from the start in the contest when on their first offensive drive they marched down the field in ten plays, ending with a 11-yard touchdown by RB **Alvin Kamara**. The Rams would quickly strike back when RB **Todd Gurley** rushed for an eight-yard score. The Saints struck back when QB **Drew Brees** found Kamara for a 16-yard score on a screen. Los Angeles knotted the score back up at the start of the second quarter when QB **Jared Goff** found wide WR **Brandin Cooks** for a four-yard touchdown.

On the next play from scrimmage, RB **Mark Ingram** lost a fumble, but the Saints defense and special teams backed the runner up when on a fourth down fake field goal attempt, LB **Craig Robertson** stopped H **Johnny Hekker** short of the first down marker. The Saints would then score 21 unanswered points in the second quarter to take a 35-17 halftime lead as they set an NFL record with 24 first half, first downs.

Goff led a furious second half rally, engineering drives for two touchdowns and one field goal to tie the score. However Brees found WR **Michael Thomas** for an 18-yard third down completion to set up a field goal and on New Orleans' next drive, the duo connected on a 72-yard touchdown.

The Saints outgained the Rams 487 yards to 483, but New Orleans scoring a touchdown following an interception in the first half and forcing the first three-and-out of the contest in the fourth quarter made for the slim difference. Thomas had 12 receptions for a franchise-record 211 yards, the NFL season's highest receiving yardage total, while Brees completed 25-of-36 passes for 346 yards, four touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 137.0 passer rating.

- Kamara scored three touchdowns for the third time this season, carrying 19 times for a game-high 82 yards with two rushing scores and catching four passes for 34 yards and a 16-yard scoring grab.

• This was New Orleans' second win against their former NFC West rivals in the past three seasons, as they haven't lost to the Rams in the Mercedes-Benz Superdome since 2007. The Saints now trail the Rams 41-33 in the all-time regular season series.

**WEEK 10: New Orleans Saints 51, Cincinnati Bengals 14; November 11, 2018 @ Mercedes-Benz Superdome** – On a day where New Orleans scored 51 points and ran up 509 total net yards, the Saints got the ball first and **Michael Thomas** ended a 15-play, 75-yard drive with a seven-yard touchdown reception from Drew Brees. Cincinnati answered with a two-yard touchdown pass from **Andy Dalton** to **John Ross**.

New Orleans moved into the second quarter successfully completing a six-play, 75-yard drive that was capped by a 28-yard touchdown on a screen pass from Drew Brees to **Mark Ingram**. The New Orleans defense forced a punt and on the Saints' next drive **Alvin Kamara** rushed for a four-yard score. After a three-and-out, a 23-yard completion from Brees to Dan Arnold set up a one-yard touchdown run for Kamara. Following an interception by **Marcus Williams** returned for 78 yards, Brees tossed a 17-yard touchdown to Thomas on the last play of the first half to give the Saints a 35-7 lead.

The Saints defense either forced Cincinnati to punt or turn-over on downs in the first three series' of the second half and on the fourth **Eli Apple** recorded his first pick as a Saint to do their part in what would end up a 51-14 rout, tied for the biggest margin of victory on the road in club history

The Saints' 244 yards rushing were a season-high. Ingram carried 13 times for 104 yards (8.0 avg.) and caught three passes for 58 yards with the TD. Sacks were tallied by **Alex Anzalone**, **Cameron Jordan**, **Sheldon Rankins** and **Alex Okafor**. The offensive line did not allow a sack for the third consecutive game.

**WEEK 11: Saints 48, Philadelphia Eagles 7; November 18, 2018 @ Mercedes-Benz Superdome** – The Saints posted an impressive home victory for their ninth straight win behind the powerful running of **Mark Ingram** and **Alvin Kamara**, the arm of **Drew Brees**, the hands of **Tre'Quan Smith** and a season-high three interceptions.

New Orleans took advantage of a defensive performance in the first quarter that gave up only 15 yards, producing two three-and-outs and an interception by CB **Marshon Lattimore** that resulted in a 10 lead on a 38-yard field goal by K **Wil Lutz** and a three-yard touchdown pass from QB **Drew Brees** to WR **Austin Carr**.

With New Orleans leading 17-0 in the second quarter, the Eagles finally got on the scoreboard on a 28-yard rushing touchdown by rookie RB **Josh Adams**. But New Orleans scored 31 consecutive points to close out the contest.

Leading 24-7 at halftime, QB **Drew Brees** completed a 23-yard touchdown pass to WR Michael Thomas on New Orleans' first drive of the second half. Ingram later scored his second rushing touchdown of the day to put New Orleans ahead comfortably at 38-7.

Brees completed 22-of-30 passes for 363 yards with four touchdown throws, zero interceptions and a 153.2 passer rating. Ingram led the club in rushing with 16 carries for 103 yards with two touchdowns. Rookie WR **Tre'Quan Smith** led the Saints in receiving with a game-high ten receptions for 157 yards and one touchdown, setting career-highs in the first two categories.

The Saints harassed Philadelphia QB **Carson Wentz**, recording three sacks and three picks. Lattimore had a team-best four solo tackles to go with the pick and two passes defended. S **Chris Banjo** tripled his career interception total

to three with two picks. DE Alex Okafor, LB **Craig Robertson** and DT **Sheldon Rankins** each picked up one sack apiece.

- Head Coach **Sean Payton** now has a 5-2 record against the Eagles, including two playoff games.
- Brees' four touchdown, zero interception performance was the 23rd of his career, surpassing Tom Brady for first place all-time in NFL record books.
- With four receptions for 92 yards and one touchdown, WR **Michael Thomas** became the first Saint to have 1,000 yards receiving in each of his first three NFL seasons.
- Lattimore's first quarter pick was his first of the season, headlining a defensive effort that gave up only 196 total net yards, only 156 through the air and 58 yards rushing.
- The Saints became only the fourth team in NFL record books to have three consecutive games with outputs of 45 or more points in the same season.

**WEEK 12: Saints 31, Atlanta Falcons 17; November 22, 2018 @ Mercedes-Benz Superdome** – The Saints ran their win streak to ten games with an impressive effort on offense and defense in a primetime showdown with Atlanta on Thanksgiving. An aggressive New Orleans defense had a season-high four takeaways and six sacks, while a balanced offensive approach with 150 yards rushing and some big plays by QB **Drew Brees** carried the Saints.

Fumble recoveries were recorded by CB **Eli Apple**, S **Vonn Bell** and S **Marcus Williams**, while LB **A.J. Klein** recorded an interception. The Saints defense surrendered only 17 points to Falcons offense that went into the contest ranked ninth in the NFL in scoring and allowed only 26 rushing yards.

New Orleans jumped out to a 17-3 halftime lead and with Brees' four touchdown passes going to WR **Austin Carr**, TE **Dan Arnold**, WR **Keith Kirkwood** and WR **Tommy Lee Lewis** it marked the first time in the Super Bowl era that four different undrafted players each had at least one receiving touchdown in a game.

- Brees would complete 15-of-22 passes for 171 yards, four touchdowns, one interception and a 111.9 passer rating, as he moved into a tie with Peyton Manning for first place in NFL record books in four-touchdown games with his 35th. Brees has tied an NFL record by throwing touchdowns to 13 different players in 2018.
- The victory gave New Orleans their first back-to-back seasons of double digit wins since the 2009-11 period.

Ahead is a synopsis of several returning players and newcomers through the draft, free agency and trade to the 2018 Saints offensive line:

**LT Terron Armstead** - The club's first third round draft choice in 2013 out of Arkansas-Pine Bluff, Armstead impressed scouts by running the fastest 40-yard dash time (4.71) by an offensive lineman in the history of the NFL Scouting Combine. He has opened 53 regular season games for New Orleans and four postseason contests and is a prime candidate for his first Pro Bowl selection in 2018, having opened nine contests.

**T/G Jermon Bushrod** - A fourth round selection in the 2007 NFL Draft out of Towson, Bushrod developed into a starting left tackle by his third season and opened 62 regular season contests at left tackle. Bushrod returns to serve as a top backup off the bench. He filled in for an injured Bushrod seamlessly in a Nov. 11 win at Cincinnati for three quarters and then has opened the next two games.

**T/G Andrus Peat** - A first round selection (13th overall) in the 2015 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Peat was considered one of the top college offensive linemen in 2014. In his final season in Palo Alto as a junior, Peat started all 13 games at left tackle and was named a first-team All-American by ESPN.com, *The Sporting News* and SI.com and received

second-team honors from the *Associated Press*. In his first three seasons, Peat has played in 43 games with 38 starts, opening a contest at every position except center. In 2017, Peat took a massive step forward, opening 15 contests at left guard and left tackle, also opening the NFC Divisional Playoff at left guard. Headed into his fourth season, Peat possesses both a veteran's experience and youthful athleticism, making him a key to the Saints' future success.

**RT Ryan Ramczyk** - The Black and Gold used their second first round selection in the 2017 NFL Draft to snag Ramczyk out of the University of Wisconsin, viewed by many as one of the best linemen in the entire draft. The 6-6, 314 lb. tackle moved from Division III Wisconsin-Stevens Point to Wisconsin, and in just one season with the Badgers, he flourished. Ramczyk started all 14 games in 2016 and was a consensus All-American, blocking for an offense that gained 203.1 rushing yards per game and allowing just one sack. Ramczyk has continued his impact in year two in holding down the right side following after opening all 16 games and both postseason contests in 2017 and being selected as a PFWA All-Rookie.

**C Max Unger** - After being acquired by the Saints via trade in the 2015 offseason, Max Unger has anchored the middle of the line for the past four seasons, starting all 58 contests he's appeared in at center and serving as a three-time team captain. A second round draft pick of the Seattle Seahawks in 2009, Unger has been named an *Associated Press* first-team All-Pro in 2012 and is a two-time Pro Bowler. The Hawaii native's opened all 124 regular season contests he has played in since 2009.

**RG Larry Warford** - Originally selected by Detroit in the third round of the 2013 NFL Draft (65<sup>th</sup> overall) out of Kentucky, this sixth-year blocker brought size, strength and foot quickness to the Saints' line in 2017, as he started all 14 regular season games and both postseason contests at right guard. New Orleans' rush offense responded to his addition, as the ground game finished fifth in the NFL as he was named to the Pro Bowl for the first time in his career.

**C/G Cameron Tom** - Signed as an undrafted free agent out of Southern Mississippi in 2017, former Catholic (Baton Rouge) High School standout was elevated from the practice squad to 53-man roster midway through his rookie year. Tom's development came into play on Oct. 21 at Baltimore, where he was sent into the lineup at left guard in place of an injured Josh LeRibeus in a come-from-behind victory.

**C/G Will Clapp** - A technically proficient player, who through the combination of size, strength and intelligence, was a three-year starter on the LSU offensive line, starting all 36 games that he appeared in (13 at center, 12 at left guard, 11 at right guard), earning first-team All-SEC honors at guard and center. Blocking for 1,000-yard rushers in each of his three college seasons, Clapp settled in at center in 2017, where he was a first-team All-SEC selection and a Rimington Trophy finalist.



## DEFENSIVE NOTES

### DEFENSIVE DRAFTS

Over the last four NFL Drafts from 2015-18, New Orleans has shown a commitment to improving the defense, spending 17-of-28 picks on that side of the ball. With nine picks in the 2015 NFL Draft, the Saints picked six defensive players, the most taken since New Orleans chose nine defensive players in a 12-round selection meeting in 1990. Below is an overview of the players selected by New Orleans from 2015-18 on the 53-man roster:

**LB Alex Anzalone, Florida (D3b-17)** - A 6-3, 241 lb. line-backer, Anzalone showcased plenty of potential at Florida. As a senior in 2016, he started the first eight contests for the Gators until a broken forearm prematurely ended his final campaign in Gainesville. Despite the shortened season, Anzalone still ranked third on the team with 53 tackles and racked up three sacks and one fumble recovery. The three-time SEC Academic Honor Roll recipient plays with both physicality and intelligence and made an immediate impact as a starter on the outside from day one in 2017 where he recorded 14 tackles, one sack and one pass defended for being placed on Injured Reserve in Week Five. Anzalone has played in all 11 games and started five contests on the inside and the outside in 2018, filling up the stat sheet by posting 38 tackles (29 solo), one interception, one sack, two passes defended and two forced fumbles.

**S Vonn Bell, Ohio State (D2b-16)** - Selected in the second round (61st overall) of the 2016 NFL Draft, Bell was a consensus All-American and one of the top rated defensive backs in the NFL Draft. As a senior, the Rossville, Ga. native was a Jim Thorpe Award semifinalist after recording 65 tackles and adding two interceptions, one brought back for a touchdown, one fumble recovery and 11 passes defended. Bell has translated that collegiate success to the NFL with ease in his first three seasons, appearing in 43 games with 28 starts and filling up the stat sheet with 226 tackles (154 solo), 5.5 sacks, nine passes defended, four forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries.

**DE Marcus Davenport, Texas-San Antonio (D1-18)** - Davenport joined the Saints with the 14th overall pick in the 2018 NFL Draft after showing potential and production as a pass rusher during his college career at Texas-San Antonio. In four seasons, Davenport posted 22 sacks, including 8.5 in 2017 when he captured Conference USA Defensive Player of the Year. Davenport's strength on the line should be a valuable asset for the Saints front, playing an important role in the club's packages in 2018, recording four sacks and a forced fumble, including a two-takedown performance in the Oct. 28 win at Minnesota.

**DT Tyeler Davison, Fresno State (D5b-15)** - This run-stopping widebody defensive lineman played in 53 career games at Fresno State from 2011-14 and made 28.5 stops for a loss and 14.5 sacks. After moving into the starting lineup in 2016, Davison continued to improve in 2017, with his 31 tackles (21 solo), one pass defended and two forced fumbles showing his true value as a run-stopper. In 2018, Davison's played an important role in the middle on a defense ranked first in opponent yards per game and fifth in opponent yards per carry, posting 15 stops, a sack, a pass defended and a forced fumble.

**Defensive end Trey Hendrickson, Florida Atlantic (D3c-17)** - This former third round draft choice in the 2017 NFL Draft (103<sup>rd</sup> overall) out of Florida Atlantic brought his raw talent, size, strength and speed to a youthful Saints defensive line. In his first season as a pro the rotational pass rusher appeared in 14 regular season games posting 14 tackles (eight solo), two sacks for 15 yards lost, two passes defended and one forced fumble.

**CB Marshon Lattimore, Ohio State (D1a-17)** - The 11th overall selection in the 2017 NFL draft and the first corner taken possesses all the traits of a lockdown defender. With his agile, fluid style, Lattimore has the ability to shut down the best wide receivers. He played a critical role in the Black and Gold pass defense unit as a rookie in 2017, as he moved into the starting lineup immediately. In October, he became the first Saints rookie since 2000 to capture NFL Defensive Rookie of the Month, when he had 16 tackles, two interceptions, one returned for a touchdown, five passes defended and a fumble recovery and also captured the award in December. For the season, he finished with 53 stops, five picks, to lead NFL rookies and the Saints, tying a team rookie record, a club-best 18 passes defended, a forced fumble and a recovery. Lattimore was the first Saints corner selected to the Pro Bowl since 1995 and was selected as *Associated Press* Defensive Rookie of the Year. His three takeaways (one interception and two fumble recoveries) in 2018 are tied for the team lead.

**DT David Onyemata, Manitoba (D4-16)** - Possessing a unique combination of size and speed, this Lagos, Nigeria native had an impressive rookie year after becoming the first player from the University of Manitoba to be drafted into the NFL. Despite being extraordinarily new to football, the 2016 fourth round draft pick became a critical member on the interior of the Saints defensive front in 2017, playing in all 16 games for the second consecutive season with six starts, making 40 tackles and two sacks, while adding three more stops in the postseason.

**DT Sheldon Rankins, Louisville (D1-16)** - Selected 12th overall in the first round of the 2016 NFL Draft, the Georgia native played in 46 games along the line at Louisville from 2012-15, producing 133 total tackles (72 solo), 31.5 tackles for loss and 18 sacks. On Nov. 12, 2017, Rankins recorded his first career interception. In the week 15 win vs. Atlanta, he closed out the contest with a sack. In the NFC Divisional Playoff at Minnesota, Rankins added his first career post-season takedown. In 2018, Rankins is ranked second on the Saints with seven sacks following a takedown in Thursday's win vs. Atlanta. He has posted 26 stops (19 solo).

**S Marcus Williams, Utah (D2-17)** - A three-year starter at Utah, Williams was twice named All-Pac 12 and earned second-team All-American as a junior before declaring for the NFL Draft. In 2016, he tied for second in the conference with five interceptions, despite missing two games due to injury. The defender boasts a dangerous mix of speed, fluidity, and instinct that allows him to read offenses and make breaks on the ball. His athleticism showed in his rookie season in 2017 as he made 70 tackles, four interceptions and six passes defended in 15 regular season games, adding ten more stops (seven solo) and another pick in two postseason contests. In 2018, he has posted 37 tackles (31 solo), two interceptions for 100 yards, three passes defended, a forced fumble/fumble recovery and two special teams stops. **CONTINUED ON NEXT PAGE**

**CB P.J. Williams, Florida State (D3b-15)** - Williams' career was limited in the beginning by missing all but two games his first two seasons with various injuries, but rebounded from the adversity early in his career to come on strong in 2017, when he played in all 16 regular season games and both postseason contests. An experienced starter from Florida State, who developed into one of the nation's top cover corners as a junior in 2014, Williams finished his college career with 123 tackles (82 solo), four interceptions and 18 passes defended. Williams finished with 47 tackles, his first two career interceptions and nine passes defended in 2017, while adding 37 more stops (30 solo), one 45-yard interception for a touchdown, one sack eight passes defended and one forced fumble in 2018 while serving primarily in the nickel cornerback role. Williams enjoyed his finest moment as a professional Oct. 28 at Minnesota, when his third quarter interception return for a 45-yard touchdown helped pace the Saints' 30-20 victory earning him NFC Defensive Player of the Week, followed up by a career-high-tying three passes defended in the win vs. the Rams, Nov. 4.

### RUSH DEFENSE

After giving up 4.4 yards per carry in 2017, in 2018, New Orleans has reduced that clip by nearly a yard, surrendering only 3.59 rushing yards per attempt to ranked second in the NFL.

### STOPPING THE RUN

The Saints have produced their most impressive run-stopping effort in several seasons through the last eight games, all wins. Until Nov. 11, the club had not surrendered 100 rushing yards to an opponent since the season opener vs. Tampa Bay, Sept. 10. The Saints had not held an opponent to under this marking point for seven consecutive games since the 2007 season. Below are the longest streaks in franchise history that the defense has gone without surrendering 100 yards. New Orleans has not allowed a 100-yard rusher in 17 straight games, surpassing the prior franchise record set in the final 13 games of the 2016 season.

## SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

### JUST KICKING IT

Between deep passes for touchdowns and athletic interceptions, players often use their hands to produce the game's flashiest plays. However, the players who use their feet often make the difference between winning and losing, between drilling clutch field goals or flipping the field with a well-executed punt.

**K Wil Lutz** went undrafted in 2016, joining the Baltimore Ravens for training camp. Prior to the start of the regular season, Lutz joined the Black and Gold and immediately took on placekicking and kickoff duties. Lutz has kicked in 43 games, converting 81-of-93 field goal attempts (87.1 percent) and 139-of-145 PATS (96.5 percent). He has also recorded 154 touchbacks on 259 career kickoffs. His 87.1 percent field goal percentage is best among kickers with at least 50 made field goals in team history. He has kicked a field goal in a club-record 32 consecutive games.

In 2018, Lutz has made 22-of-23 field goal attempts, including his last 20, to tie for the second-longest streak in club record books, 43-of-44 PAT attempts and has recorded 47 touchbacks, also adding one special teams tackle. He leads the National Football League in scoring with 109 points, his 21 field goals are tied for third in the league and his 43 PATs rank first.

P **Thomas Morstead** was the first punter drafted by the Saints since 1984. The club's fifth round draft choice (164<sup>th</sup> overall) in 2009 from Southern Methodist University, Morstead has been a weapon in the field position game with his strong leg, outstanding placement abilities and booming kickoffs. In ten seasons, he has a gross average of 46.9 on 551 punts with a 41.4 net and 192 punts inside the 20-yard line, while also booming 259 kickoffs in the end zone for touchbacks. Morstead is ranked 12th on the club's all-time games played list with 153 regular season appearances and his consistency has carried over to the 2018 season, where he's averaged a 43.1 net punting average, with eight dropped inside-the-20.

### SWISS ARMY KNIFE

New Orleans QB **Taysom Hill**, in his second year with the club, has brought unheralded versatility to the Saints on both offense and special teams. A participant on every special teams unit except field goal and PAT, as well as a signal-caller, runner and receiver on offense, Hill has averaged 25.1 yards per return on 12 kickoff returns, has five coverage stops to rank second on the team and completed a ten-yard pass on a fake punt in Week Four. Overall in 2018, Hill's carried 32 times for 174 yards, ranked third on the team, with a club best 5.4 average and has completed three of six passes for 64 yards.

### COVERAGE/BLOCK UNITS

New Orleans' coverage units have been led the past two seasons by S **Chris Banjo** and DB **Justin Hardee**. Hardee led the team with nine stops and a blocked punt recovered for a touchdown as a rookie in 2017 and Banjo finished with eight tackles and a forced fumble. Hardee leads the team with eight stops with Hill ranked second with five stops and Banjo ranked third with four. DE **Alex Okafor** also made a game-changing play at Atlanta, Sept. 23, when his third quarter blocked punt that was recovered by LB **Craig Robertson** at the Falcons 16-yard line, set up a subsequent New Orleans touchdown. Robertson also made a big play in the November 4 win over Los Angeles when he stopped H Johnny Hecker short of the first down marker on a fake field goal attempt. New Orleans' punt coverage unit ranks fourth in the NFL, surrendering only 4.6 yards per return.

## QUARTERBACKS

### DREW BREES

- Since signing with the Saints as an unrestricted free agent in 2006 from the San Diego Chargers, quarterback Drew Brees has thrown for 4,000 or more yards in each of his 12 seasons with the club, became the only National Football League signal-caller to throw for 5,000 yards five different times and ranked at or near the top in every passing category.

- Brees is enjoying another standout campaign in 2018, completing 272-of-356 passes (76.4%) for 3,135 yards with 29 touchdowns, only two interceptions and a 127.3 passer rating. Brees is currently ranked first in the National Football League in completion percentage, passer rating, fourth quarter passer rating (133.9), second in interception percentage and third in touchdown passes and third down passer rating (112.8), while setting the league's all-time records in both completions and passing yardage and moving into second place in Week 10 in scoring throws.

- Since first signing with New Orleans in 2006 and starting all 201 regular season games he has appeared in, surpassing K Morten Andersen first place in club record books for games played, Brees leads the NFL with 61,232 passing yards, 437 touchdown passes, 7,841 attempts, 5,369 completions, a 68.5% completion percentage, 107 games with at least 300 yards passing, 16 with at least 400 yards passing, 470 completions of 25 yards or more and stands at third in the league with a 100.9 passer rating.

- Brees has been selected to play in a team-record ten Pro Bowls as a member of the Saints, with 11 overall berths in the National Football League's all-star game, twice as a starter, including his most recent selection in 2017. His seven consecutive selections (2008-14) as a Saint is tied for first in club history with Pro Football Hall of Fame tackle William Roaf.

## QUARTERBACKS

- Brees has posted a 122-79 regular season mark in games he has started since signing with the Saints in 2006. In Week 15 of the 2016 season, Brees earned his 100th regular season victory in a Saints uniform. Including his seven playoff victories, his 129 total wins as a member of the Saints make him the winningest quarterback in team history and the NFL's second-winningest signal-caller since 2006.

- In his 18-year NFL playing career during which he has appeared in 260 regular season games with 259 starts, ranked sixth in league record books for signal-callers, Brees has completed 6,494-of-9,650 passes (67.3%) for 73,580 yards, 517 touchdown passes and a 97.9 passer rating. He's stands as the NFL's all-time most accurate passer, became the league's recordholder in completions on Sept. 23, the passing yardage leader on Oct. 8, is ranked second in touchdowns and third in passer rating.

- The Saints have been led six times in the postseason behind the arm of Brees, who in the playoffs, has started all 13 games he has appeared in, 12 as a member of the Saints. He has completed 354-of-537 passes (65.9 pct.) for 4,209 yards, 29 touchdown passes, nine interceptions and a 101.6 passer rating, while posting a 7-6 mark, 7-5 as the starting signal-caller for the Saints from 2006-present.

**10** – In the postseason, Brees' passing yardage (3,915) and completions (329) numbers both rank tenth in National Football League record books. Also, the team record number of seasons that Brees has been selected to the Pro Bowl.

**13** – Number of seasons Brees thrown 25 or more touchdowns, tied for second in National Football League record books with Tom Brady (13) and behind Manning (16). Also the number of seasons, all consecutive that Brees has tossed for at least 4,000 yards.

**14** – Also, with 13 300-yard games in 2011, Brees set the National Football League single-season record, surpassing the one he previously tied with 10 in 2008.

**15** – After tossing for 171 yards on Thanksgiving night vs. Atlanta, 2018 became Brees' 15th consecutive season with 3,000 yards passing, a feat surpassed only by Brett Favre (18).

**16** – National Football League-record number of regular season contests where Brees has thrown for at least 400 yards after tossing for 439 yards in the Sept. 9 season opener vs. Tampa Bay. In 2018, Brees became the fourth player in National Football League records to have 16 3,000-yard passing seasons, joining Brett Favre (18) and tied with Manning and Brady.

**21** – On Nov. 11 at Cincinnati, Brees jumped over the pile for a one-yard touchdown in the third quarter to give him 21 career rushing touchdowns.

**54** – Consecutive regular season contests between 2009-12 with at least one touchdown pass, the longest streak in National Football League history, surpassing the record previously held by Johnny Unitas (47). It was set on Oct. 7, 2012 vs. San Diego. It ended on Nov. 29, 2012 after a TD-free outing at Atlanta.

**58** – National Football League-record number of games with at least 30 completions, ahead of Manning (38). Also, the NFL-record number of consecutive regular season contests where Brees threw at least 20 completions until October 13, 2013 at New England.

**66** – Players that Brees' 517 career touchdown passes have gone to. In the Thanksgiving vs. Atlanta, wide receiver Keith Kirkwood became the 66th player and the 51st Saint to catch a touchdown from Brees.

**67.3** – Career completion percentage, ranked first in National Football League record books.

**68.5** – Team-record completion percentage as a Saint, ranked first in the National Football League during this 13-season period.

**72.0** – Completion percentage in 2017 by Brees that set an National Football League record. Through 2018, he's completed a league-best 76.4% of his throws, on pace to break his own league record.

**81** – Players who have caught a pass from Brees in the

regular season, including himself off of deflections.

**89.7** – Career-high completion percentage by Brees in the Oct. 8 win over Washington, when he fired on 26 of 29 throws.

**103.0** – Career passer rating indoors during the regular season, ranked third in the NFL All-time.

**107** – Club-record regular season contests by Brees with 300 yards or more passing as a Saint, the highest total since 2006. Brees has reached the 300-yard mark 114 times, ahead of Manning (93) for the most all-time. Brees has done so five times in 2018.

**108** – Games by Brees as a Saint where he's posted a passer rating of 100 or more (min. 10 attempts) owning a 85-23 record in these contests, including posting a 111.9 mark in Thursday night's victory over Atlanta. Overall, in his 18-year career, he has reached the milestone 123 times, having done so in nine of 11 games in 2018.

### ALVIN KAMARA

- A talented runner and receiver with a 5-10, 215-pound frame who was selected by the Saints in the third round of the 2017 NFL Draft out of the Tennessee, Kamara enjoyed an outstanding rookie campaign. He ranked first on the club and sixth in the NFL in total yards from scrimmage (1,554), second on the team in rushing and receiving, carrying 120 times for 728 yards (6.1 avg.) with eight TDs and a two-point conversion, while catching 81 passes for 826 yards (10.2 avg.) with five TDs and a kickoff return for a TD for a club rookie record 14 total scores, tied for second in the NFL with teammate Mark Ingram. Kamara finished the regular season ranked first in the NFL in yards per carry.

- He was the first Saints offensive rookie selected to the Pro Bowl since RB Rueben Mayes in 1986, as an *Associated Press* second team All-Pro at the Flex position, the clubs' first rookie All-Pro since KR Tyrone Hughes in 1993 and was named *The Sporting News* NFL Rookie of the Year and the *Associated Press* Offensive Rookie of the Year.

## FAMOUS COMPANY

With eight rushing touchdowns and five receiving touchdowns in 2017, Alvin Kamara was one of only four rookies in NFL record books to have at least five rushing touchdowns and five receiving touchdowns, joining three Pro Football Hall of Famers in Doak Walker (1950), Charley Taylor (1964) and Gale Sayers (1964). Adding in his kickoff return touchdown, Kamara joined Sayers as the only rookie in NFL history with at least eight rushing touchdowns, five receiving scores and one return touchdown.

Kamara totaled 81 receptions, second-highest among running backs and the highest rookie reception total. His 826 receiving yards set a club record for running backs as well.

**MARK INGRAM II**

• One of the club's two first round draft picks in 2011, the 2009 Heisman Trophy winner has been an integral part of the rushing attack since his arrival in New Orleans as the 28th overall pick. For his career, he ranks second in club record books with 5,802 yards rushing, second with 48 rushing touchdowns and fourth with 53 total touchdowns. In 2017, Ingram picked back up where he left off in 2016, playing in all 16 games with 12 starts and leading the team in rushing with 230 carries for a career-best 1,124 yards (4.9 avg.) with 12 touchdowns and adding a career-best 58 receptions for a 416 yards for 1,540 total yards from scrimmage as he was selected to his second Pro Bowl. • A talented rookie wideout, who was selected by New Orleans in the third round of the draft out of Central Florida, the 6-1, 210-pounder emerged as one of the Knights' top weapons from 2015-17 and was a key figure in the emergence of their program. During that period, he caught 168 passes for 2,748 yards (16.4 avg.) with 22 touchdowns. • Selected by the Arizona Cardinals in the fourth round of the 2013 NFL Draft, Okafor joined the Saints in 2017 as an unrestricted free agent, where he has added valuable depth on the defensive line. Okafor has appeared in 63 games with 46 starts in six years, collecting 21 sacks, an interception, three forced fumbles, one fumble recovery, ten passes defended and a blocked punt. In 2017, he had 37 tackles (26 solo), 4.5 sacks to tie for second behind Jordan, four passes defended and two forced fumbles. Recovered from an Achilles injury suffered in Week 11, Okafor re-signed in the offseason opened the 2018 season opener as a productive counterpart opposite Jordan and has posted 21 tackles (16 solo), three sacks, one pass defended and one blocked punt in starting all 11 contests for the 10-1 Saints.

### MARCUS DAVENPORT

• Trading up to the 14<sup>th</sup> spot in the 2018 NFL Draft, the Saints addressed the defensive line and the club's pass rush with this gifted pass rusher, only the second draft choice ever from Texas-San Antonio. During his four collegiate seasons, Davenport notched career totals of 186 tackles (97 solo), 22 sacks, 38 tackles for loss, six forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries, one returned for a touchdown and eight passes defended, finishing his career as the school's all-time leader for stops for loss, takedowns and quarterback hurries (21). In eight games, Davenport has posted 12 tackles (eight solo), four sacks, third among rookies, two passes defended and one forced fumble.

## DEFENSIVE TACKLES

### TYLER DAVISON

• This former fifth round draft pick has been a vital part of the Saints defensive line since being drafted in the 2015 NFL Draft (154<sup>th</sup> overall). The Fresno State product followed up his first two seasons with an even more productive campaign in 2017, helping the defense post 42 sacks, ranking seventh in the league and allowing only 20.4 points

per game, good for tenth in the NFL. He started all 16 games posting 31 tackles (21 solo), one pass defended and two forced fumbles. Overall in four seasons, the disruptive defensive tackle has 101 tackles (54 solo), 2.5 sacks, two pass deflections and three forced fumbles. In 2018, he's made 15 tackles (four solo), one sack and one forced fumble, being a run-stopping force for a defense ranked first in the National Football League in opponent rushing yards per game and second in yards per a rushing attempt.

### SHELDON RANKINS

• The third defensive lineman selected in the 2016 NFL Draft out of Louisville, Sheldon Rankins started all 16 games in 2017 posting 26 tackles (16 solo), two sacks for loss of 13 yards, one interception, one pass defended and one forced fumble. He helped a defensive unit that went from 31<sup>st</sup> in the NFL, allowing 28.4 points per game in 2016 to allowing 20.4 points per game in 2017, good for tenth in the league. In his first full season after missing seven contests as a rookie, Rankins' ability to rush the passer from the inside as well as take on double teams proved beneficial in 2017 helping the defense post 42 sacks, ranking seventh in the league, compared to only 30 takedowns in 2016. In 2018, Rankins has 26 tackles (19 solo) and seven sacks to ranked second on the club and tied for second in the NFL among defensive tackles after recording takedowns in each of the last three contests.

### DAVID ONYEMATA

• A fourth round selection out of Manitoba in 2016, Onyemata has teamed with Davison and Rankins to form a solid front in the interior. In 42 games with ten starts, he's posted 99 career tackles, two sacks, one pass defended, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. In ten games with four starts in 2018, Onyemata has posted 22 tackles, in helping with a run defense ranked first in the NFL.

## LINEBACKERS

Key free agent acquisitions in both 2017 and 2018 combined with an extra year of growth for younger players have rendered the Saints linebacking corps a hard-hitting squad with a solid mix of both youth and experience.

### ALEX ANZALONE

- One of three third round picks in 2017, Anzalone came to the Saints after a solid career at Florida. In his rookie season, Anzalone started four games before suffering a season-ending shoulder injury and posted 16 tackles, a sack and a pass defended. In 11 games with five starts in 2018, he's posted 38 tackles (29 solo), one sack, one interception, two passes defended and two forced fumbles.

### DEMARIO DAVIS

- This dependable and sure-tackling defender joined the Saints after a breakout 2017, where he started 16 games for the Jets. Davis enjoyed his best season, posting a team-high and career-high 165 tackles (112 solo), a career-best five sacks, tied for second in the inside linebackers, three passes defended and a fumble recovery. For his career, the Brandon, Miss. native has appeared in 107 games with 93 starts for the Jets (2012-15, 2017), Cleveland (2016) and Saints, recording 736 tackles (483 solo), 16.5 sacks, an interception, 18 passes defended, three forced fumbles, four fumble recoveries and 24 special team stops.

- In 2018, Davis has opened all 11 contests at the weakside position and leads the team with 76 stops (54 solo), three sacks to lead the linebacker corps, one pass defended and two forced fumbles. Davis' abilities to diagnose and tackle have played a key role in New Orleans ranking first in the NFL in opponent rushing yards per game and second in opponent rushing yards per play.

### A.J. KLEIN

- Signed as an unrestricted free agent from Carolina in 2017, where he spent his first four seasons, Klein's played a significant role in the linebacker rotation. Opening 12 games on the strongside in his first season with the club, Klein had 54 tackles (37 solo), two sacks, five passes defended and one forced fumble. In 11 contests with ten starts in 2018, he's posted 51 tackles (31 solo), one interception, three passes defended and a fumble recovery, playing a key role in a run defense ranked 5th in the NFL in opponent yards per rush and fifth in opponent rushing yards per game.

## DEFENSIVE BACKS

### MARSHON LATTIMORE

- Selected by the Saints in the first round (11<sup>th</sup> overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft, Lattimore captured a starting position in training camp and started all 13 games he appeared in. He totaled 53 tackles (44 solo), a forced fumble, one fumble recovery, five interceptions for 85 yards and 18 passes defended, as he became the youngest Saint (21 years old) ever selected to the Pro Bowl and was selected as the AP NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year.

- In 2018, Lattimore has opened all 11 contests and has posted 34 tackles (27 solo), one interception, seven passes defended, two forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries, returned for 91 yards, to tie for the team lead in takeaways.

### OUT OF THE MARSH

Lattimore came through for the defense at the New York Giants (9/30). He made a big play in the second quarter when he picked up a fumble forced by his teammate P.J. Williams and returned it to the New York 11-yard line 37 yards. He finished adding four solo tackles for his effort. Lattimore was also assigned to Giants standout WR Odell Beckham Jr., who averaged only 8.6 yards per catch.

In the Oct. 28 win at Minnesota, Lattimore picked up a fumble deep in Saints territory and returned it 54 yards to set up a touchdown before halftime that gave New Orleans the lead for good.

In the November 8 win at Philadelphia, Lattimore recorded his first pick of the 2018 season in the first quarter of the 48-7 win.

In a Thanksgiving night win vs. Atlanta, Lattimore stripped Falcons WR Calvin Ridley at the New Orleans three-yard line, saving a touchdown and ensuring the Saints' tenth straight victory.

### ELI APPLE

- The tenth overall pick of the New York Giants in the 2016 NFL Draft out of Ohio State and a former teammate in the Buckeyes defensive backfield with Lattimore and Vonn Bell, since being acquired by New Orleans, Bell has made a positive impact in the Saints secondary. In the four games Apple's started, the Black and Gold have surrendered 20 or fewer points three times and he's picked up an interception and a fumble recovery.

**MARCUS WILLIAMS**

• After being selected in the second round of the 2017 NFL Draft (42<sup>nd</sup> overall) out of Utah, this ball-hawking safety had an excellent rookie campaign starting all 15 games he appeared in posting 70 tackles (56 solo), four interceptions and six passes defended. Williams led rookie safeties in interceptions and was second in tackles and passes defended, including two picks in the regular season finale. He also posted his first career postseason interception, which was the only pick made by a rookie in the playoffs. Williams has built on an impressive rookie season as one of the centerpieces of one of the NFL's youngest defensive backfields, tying for the club lead with two picks in 2018 and with a fumble recovery on Thanksgiving night vs. Atlanta, tying for the team lead with three total takeaways.

**YOUNG BACKFIELD**

With five and four interceptions respectively as rookies in 2017, Lattimore and Williams finished ranked first and tied for second respectively in picks among first-year players, setting the stage for a promising Saints secondary. In 2018, Lattimore and Williams are tied for the team lead in takeaways with three apiece.

**KURT COLEMAN**

• This smart, versatile veteran safety brings experience and a wealth of knowledge to a young secondary. A seventh round pick (244th overall) of the Eagles in the 2010 NFL Draft out of Ohio State, after spending his first five seasons in Philadelphia and Kansas City, Coleman recorded 11 interceptions over three seasons in Carolina. Overall, he's appeared in 127 regular season games with 81 starts, posting 518 tackles, two sacks, 21 interceptions, two returns for TDs, 29 passes defended, four forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and 35 special teams stops. In 2018, he's played in 11 games with seven starts and has posted 21 stops (14 solo).

**VONN BELL**

• Bell left onlookers impressed with his 2016 rookie campaign. Playing in every game with 14 starts, he totaled 98 tackles (59 solo), second on the team, four passes de-

fensed, a sack, two forced fumbles, and a fumble recovery. Selected in the second round of the 2016 NFL Draft (61st overall), Bell was a consensus first-team All-American as a junior at Ohio State. In 2017, he played in all 16 games with ten starts and posted a team-high 78 tackles (57 solo), 4.5 sacks, tied for second on the club and lead defensive backs, two passes defended, two forced fumbles and five special teams stops. He led the Saints with 17 postseason stops and added a key takedown late in the NFC Wild Card Playoff win vs. Carolina. In 2018, he leads the secondary with 50 tackles (38 solo), two passes defended and a fumble recovery on Thanksgiving night vs. Atlanta.

**SAINTS POSTGAME NOTES**

- With the win, New Orleans Saints starts the regular season 10-1, giving the franchise their 12th double-digit win season in franchise history with seven having taken place under Head Coach Sean Payton.
- The Saints return to action on Thursday (11/29) in AT&T Stadium in Arlington, Texas when they face the Dallas Cowboys. The game will air on FOX and the NFL Network at 7:20 p.m. CT.
- Today's win gave the Saints a 10-1 record through the first 11 games, the only better start for the club would be their 13-0 start in 2009.
- With the win today, the Saints run their winning streak to ten games, giving them their second-such win streak, second to a 13-game winning streak to start the season in 2009.
- The Saints currently have a streak of 267 regular season games without having been shut out, dating back to a 26-20 victory at the Tampa Bay Buccaneers on September 6, 2002 at Raymond James Stadium, the longest running streak in the National Football League and the fifth-longest all-time.
- The Head Coach-Starting QB duo of Sean Payton and Drew Brees opened their 185th game together tonight, moving them past the Don Shula-Dan Marino combination for second place in NFL history.
- The Saints defense held the Falcons to 12 yards rushing in the first half.
- The Saints defense recorded a season-high four turnovers and a season-high six sacks.
- The Saints outrushed the Falcons 150-26.
- QB **Drew Brees** completed 15-of-22 passes for 171 yards, four touchdowns and a 111.9 rating. Brees played in his 260th career game today, moving him into a tie for 32nd all-time in NFL record books with Nick Lowery and Julius Peppers. Brees has 3,135 passing yards in 2018, marking his 15th 3,000-passing yard season, moving him out of a tie with Tom Brady and in third behind Peyton Manning (16) and Brett Favre (18). Brees' five-yard touchdown pass to Keith Kirkwood made the undrafted rookie him the 51st Saints player to record a touchdown catch from Brees. Brees has now thrown a touchdown to 66 players overall in his career. Tonight's game marked Brees' 157th multi-touchdown game and his 35th four touchdown pass game, tying him for first in NFL history in the latter category with Peyton Manning. Brees also has tied an NFL record by throwing a touchdown pass to 13 different players this year, tying Matt Ryan (2016).
- RB **Mark Ingram** played in his 101st career game today. Ingram finished with 52 rushing yards on 11 carries.
- RB **Alvin Kamara** finished the game with a team-high 89 rushing yards on 14 carries.
- WR **Michael Thomas** finished with four catches for 38 yards.
- WR **Austin Carr** recorded his second touchdown as a Saint, hauling in a 12-yard touchdown pass from Brees.
- WR **Keith Kirkwood** recorded his first touchdown of the season and of his career, hauling in a five-yard touchdown pass.
- WR **Tommy Lee Lewis** scored the first touchdown of the game and his first of the season, catching a 28-yard pass from Brees.
- TE **Dan Arnold** recorded his first career touchdown, hauling in a 25-yard pass from Brees. Arnold finished the game with a team-high 45 yards on four receptions.
- DE **Cameron Jordan** started in his 123rd consecutive game tonight, having never missed a game, moving him past RB **Fred McAffee** for sole possession of 29th on the club's all-time games played list. Jordan has 67.5 career sacks with his two takedowns tonight, moving into a tie for fourth with DE Will Smith (2004-12). Jordan finished the game with two sacks, four total tackles and three hits on the quarterback.
- DE **Sheldon Rankins** recorded his seventh sack of the season, taking down Falcons quarterback Matt Ryan for a seven-yard loss.
- DE **Tyler Davison** deflected a pass by quarterback Matt Ryan, which was then intercepted by LB **A.J. Klein** for a six-yard return. Klein's first interception of the season.
- LB **Alex Anzalone** forced a fumble just before half, recovered by S **Vonn Bell**. Anzalone finished with six total tackles.



- LB **Demario Davis** recorded his third sack of the season, taking down Falcons signal-caller Matt Ryan for a seven-yard loss.
- CB **Marshon Lattimore** recorded his first force fumble of the season, recovered by CB **Eli Apple** for a two-yard gain. Lattimore finished the game with five tackles (four solo) and two passes defended.
- CB **Eli Apple** recorded a team-high ten total tackles (eight solo).
- CB **P.J. Williams** recorded his first career sack, creating a ten-yard loss. Williams finished with six total tackles (five solo).
- S **Marcus Williams** recorded a strip sack, forced fumble and recovery on quarterback Matt Ryan for a four-yard loss. Williams finished the game with five total tackles.
- S **Vonn Bell** finished the game with seven total tackles and a fumble recovery.
- K **Wil Lutz** nailed a 22-yard field goal and converted four extra points. Lutz has made 20 consecutive field goals for the second time in his career, tied for the second most consecutive in club record books with his streak from 2016-17 and one by kicker Morten Andersen from Nov. 24, 1985-Oct. 5, 1986.
- P **Thomas Morstead** punted three times for 144 total yards (48.0 avg.) with a long of 56 yards.

(opening statement) "Happy Thanksgiving to everyone. Obviously, when you play on this day and you have the night game, it's not like you have the whole day at all (for enjoyment). You are really getting ready for the game. I'm proud of the way that our guys played. Obviously, the turnovers were significant, the rushing yards (were significant). All of the things that lead to winning or keep you from winning were on display tonight. I am proud of our defense. I thought that we ran the ball well. It was a good win, a good division win."

(on the defense getting better each week) "It is good news. We played some good offenses. Cincinnati's a good offense. The Eagles are a good offense. I feel like we're playing a complementary game relative to time of possession, third downs, all of those things. Tonight was no different."

(on why the defense was effective getting multiple turnovers tonight) "A lot of it is effort. We had four of them; one right down on the half-yard line."

(on the rushing defense tonight) "It certainly helps when you can hold an opponent to twenty-something yards. It helps when you know what's coming, if they are one-dimensional. That was the case tonight."

(on the defense gaining confidence) "I think that we are constantly talking about improvement or going the other way. I think that you can think it and you can want it and hope for it, but you have to, at some point, demonstrate it. And when you do that then there are actual moments where you can see a young player gain confidence because maybe he covered a kick the right way, maybe he fit the run the right way and he believes he can do it; and he starts doing it over and over again. I think that we are playing better and better. We still have work to do. It's encouraging."

(on the improvement of the red zone defense) "It's significant, I thought, just to hold them to a field goal after our turnover was a big possession."

(on the four players who were not drafted having touchdowns tonight) "I did not realize that. I do not think we really pay attention to it. We're focused on the opponent and the plan, who's healthy, how are we going to get guys involved. I think one of the things that they do well, let's ask them to do those things. Obviously, Drew (Brees) is someone who is very confident in the preparation and confident in the players around him. There is a lot that goes into that. All of a sudden you have a few big plays like we had tonight."

(on the depth of the team on offense) "It has been a lot of different players (contributing), tight ends. You are always hoping to stay healthy, and yet we don't live in that world in this league. That is encouraging (that we have options). I'm excited for those guys that received opportunities. We will keep working to get better."

(on having success running up the middle) "Sometimes it's a six or seven-hole play that cuts up, sometimes it's outside. I thought that we played well up front. Right from the start we ran a simple power scheme for a nice gain. I think credit Atlanta; and I say that because they are dealing with a lot of injuries on defense. They are playing without a lot of guys that have really been the heartbeat of that defense, captains, Pro Bowl players, guys that we actually had a chance to coach last year. Those are big losses (for them)."

(on if the team has talked about the Super Bowl) "No, not at all, only because there is so much football here. It's a division opponent. In our league, rivalry is not a good word for it. You have two teams that have a long, storied history of playing each other. They've been in what was the NFC West for a while, now it is the NFC South. We've always had good, competitive games, tough games. We're way, way, way shorter-focused right now, rather than extended like that. And I think that that has served us well. Every week I hear someone say, 'They're getting ready for the tough stretch of

their schedule. Shoot, all of these games are tough, starting with trips to Baltimore, trips to Minnesota, the Rams. The focus for us is the next game. We play a week from now. We will be on a normal week schedule. People ask about tickets. It's always, 'Text me the week of (I say).' I couldn't tell you who we play three weeks from now. That is the way it should be. We were focused on this game and now we will have to get ready to play a real good Dallas team who is playing well, who is really playing well in the last three weeks."

(on if he ever felt comfortable that the defense was in control) "Two weeks in a row we played teams that we have tremendous respect for their firepower and their ability to score. When you play those teams, I don't know that you ever quite get comfortable because I have just seen it happen and I have been a part of it in one playoff game in San Francisco. I was very comfortable when they were checking the ball down and throwing underneath, with the clock being on our side. We were concerned about the quick-strike plays with their skill players. I thought that we handled that well. Just like last week, those teams can score fast."

(Opening Statement) “I told the team, (it’s) the most challenged we’ve been over the last three years. It can be frustrating and confusing for sure. The storyline was pretty simple though at the end in terms of the ball(game). I thought the team played hard and the energy was right, the fight was right, but we didn’t play well in terms of our execution and certainly our ability to create takeaways and take care of the ball. If you looked at the final, I thought they were able to stop the run and we did not do a good enough job defensively to make that the factor in the game. I said we needed to finish drives in the end zone and we had three turnovers in the red zone. For us what’s next is a long weekend. We’ve got to reset and we’ve got work to do to play like we need to play and how we’re capable of playing. At the end of the day, (there’s) a lot of work for us to do to get our game right. It’s a pretty simple storyline.”

(On three lost fumbles in red zone) “When you have one it feels like a lot, but when you have three down there, I thought that was the real story of the game. We knew that would be a factor coming in, and it was.”

(On regrouping after Saints score 17 straight points) “Well I thought we had a chance and then we figured a two minute at the end of the half to see if we could go and then have the ball again to start the half. So as poorly as we’d played early on, I knew we really had a chance to get right back in the game defensively, excuse me, right back in the game starting with the ball. Not scoring on the opening drive I thought that was a setback for us. We said we were going to be aggressive on fourth down. I think we ended up with six of them on the night, four out of six. Not being able to get our run game established that adds to the (lack of) balance. I thought our play action plan, what we needed was going to be right but when we didn’t match that in our run game, I thought that was one of the real factors they were able to control the clock some with their run game. I thought that, along with the turnovers, was the real story of this game.”

(On Saints’ play action tonight) “Yes, they definitely took some shots to the seam and the big touchdown, I think their first touchdown pass, was one that we see quite a bit of the time. At the end of it, it wasn’t the pass game that did us in today. I don’t know what they ended up throwing for but on a day where he (Drew Brees) throws for under 200 yards is usually ones on the other side that you sign up for but what you don’t want are four touchdown passes.”

(On not being able to establish the running game) “It made it challenging for sure. I knew they would play well against the run and we would have to have some passes to try and open up the run game, especially on the play action side of things. I thought that part of it went according to plan. What didn’t was the ability to convert some of those runs. We knew we would have to have some passes to set up the run in this game, but they played so well against the run but not to get that part going was a factor in this game.”

(On offensive line problems) “We’ll go back through it (film) hard and look at it. (We will) See if there is a change that needs to be made and will. Nothing will stop us from what we need to do to get the job done. Not saying we will, but it’ll give us something to take a look at.”

(On not playing Deadrin Senat tonight) “He actually played a little bit better against Dallas but it was more of a factor of how many pass rushers we could get up and get going. He’s been up for about 15, 16 snaps and we wanted to add the fullback back into it. It was just a coaching decision on what we thought would be the best to win the game. It was no stretch on him. I told him that too from a performance side of things.”

“Let’s do it, go ahead it is Thanksgiving. Happy Thanksgiving everyone! I have family waiting.”

(On the energy from the home crowd) “I love it. It was awesome, they were amped up and the defense fed off it. The defense played tremendous today against a really explosive offense, got four turnovers, which was a huge stat in the game. Just the energy and the emotion on Thanksgiving Day, it was great.”

(On how this team is built to win) “When the defense plays like that and we are getting five yards a rush, like we did today, those are all great things. So, for me as a quarterback, it is still about managing a game the best way that I can. When there are opportunities for big plays, we make them; convert third downs, we got to possess the ball so we can put together good drives and go score points and play that complementary brand of football.”

(On the collection of young talent on the Saints roster) “Well, each week, especially the last three weeks, you have seen just the level of confidence, growth and maturity out of some young players, on both sides of the ball. They are stepping into roles, getting significant playing time and really having to contribute in a big way. They just have to continue to get better and better. I think their confidence is building with that too and I feel like we are just scratching the surface.”

(On the young defensive players on the Saints roster) “They are playing with a ton of confidence and swagger and just a belief.”

(On throwing four touchdown passes to four undrafted free agents tonight) “I have heard that stat, I love that stat. That is actually one of my favorite ones. It says a lot about them. It says a lot about taking advantage of the opportunity and stepping up when we need it. We are down some receivers from the beginning of the year until now and these guys have had to step into these roles and do some things that maybe weren’t expected. It is just a growth process, it is fun to watch the grow and gain confidence and build chemistry, which typically takes time, but they have been thrust into this role. Especially on a short week, this was a challenge; you start playing and thinking about matchups; these are all things that I think keep me up at night. As I’m thinking from play to play, it’s about moving the ball and finding that matchup. With young guys stepping up and making the play and having those four guys, Austin Carr, Dan Arnold, Tommylee Lewis, and Keith Kirkwood, right. All of them to play the way they did, to each get a touchdown on Thanksgiving Day with all of their family and friends watching at home is pretty cool.”

(On Dan Arnold’s touchdown) “It was a great catch, he had just a seam route and beat the other guy. It was one of those where you put it out in front of him and he’s a big target, so he went up there and pulled it down and really made a great play. He had told me earlier, he said he wanted to make up for the one that happened at the goal line on third down where the guy knocked it out. He said ‘I should have never let that guy knock it out of my hands’. So, he held onto that one.”

(On winning two games in five days) “This is a challenge obviously. Going into the Philly game we knew we were going to play three games in about 11 days. So, Philly, Atlanta and then we go to Dallas a week from now. That’s tough to do, so guys need to be really diligent with getting their bodies ready to turn around in four days and play and now obviously, turnaround in seven days to play. I think guys have just stayed very focused, very diligent, we had a good plan this week for how we were going to come out and play this game and now we got to plan and get ready to go to Dallas.”

(On the teams’ confidence level) “Listen, it is fun, we are having fun. We enjoy being around each other, we enjoy going to work. We work hard. We understand that it is the preparation during the week and it is the work during the week that allows us to go out and play this way, and play with that confidence that we are playing with. It is fun to find different ways to win. It is fun to come out and the defense has four turnovers and you have four undrafted guys catch touchdowns, right. That is fun, it has been a while since any of that stuff has happened. So, you just keep finding new ways to win,

you keep finding guys who step up and make plays and you begin to envision how this thing is going to look next week and the week after and just as we continue to build on what we have established.”

(On the teams’ confidence level going into their second game against Atlanta this season) “Well, we felt like we go into every game feeling like we want to run the ball, we want to be balanced. We got a nice lead early in the third quarter, but knowing how explosive they are, they can score at will. For us it was about possessing the ball, controlling the clock, getting points and touchdowns when we could. At the same time when we can rush for five yards a pop and I think we had about 31 rushes for a buck fifty, something like that, so that is really good rushing yardages.”

(On the turnovers) "I had the pick. Alex (Anzalone) had a great forced fumble. Marshon (Lattimore) chased down and forced the fumble. You can't say enough about the effort we're playing with. **QB Matt Ryan**

(On how tough the loss was) “Yes, it’s very difficult. Obviously we’re disappointed with how the game shaped out tonight. I thought we did some good things offensively, but when you turn the football over four times against a really good football team that’s playing with a lot of momentum, that’s too much to overcome. We need to be better than that as we move forward. We’ve got an extended weekend here to get some rest, but also to take a look in the mirror and find ways that we can all be better and that’s what we need to do.”

(On if he saw the safety come through during his fumble) “Yes, I have to take a look at it. I didn’t know where it got tipped from. I can give you a better answer after I’ve had an opportunity to look at it.”

(On the uncharacteristic amount of turnovers tonight by the offense) “Well, I do not know where it came from. You know that hasn’t been our style up until this point. Credit to New Orleans. They did a good job of taking it away, but we’ve got to be better than that offensively. We had opportunities to come away with a lot more points than we did tonight, but when you give them the football especially in the low red (zone) when we have opportunities to come away with points, it’s tough to overcome.”

(On how to move on after this week from the game) “Well, I think the mindset after tonight with the long weekend, is for each of us individually take a look in the mirror and see what we have to do better to help our team play better than we have up until this point. And that is what I am going to do. And then when we get back to work Monday, it is about going out and having the best Monday practice that we have had. But to make it any more, you know, long-sided than that, I think you cannot do that as an athlete. You have to stay in the moment. You have stay in present with what you’re doing. And that what my message would be to those guys.”

(On what the message to the players hanging their heads, specifically Calvin Ridley after his fumble) “I did not really say anything. We got the ball back pretty quickly after him – after that on the sidelines. I’ll have an opportunity to sit down with him. One thing that I have learned in playing for as long as I have, is sometimes those things are going to happen. You’re going to have nights like tonight. But what makes you a great professional is how you’re going to respond to nights like tonight and how your process, getting yourself ready to go during the week is, you know, better after having an outing like that. (On the rivalry here on Thanksgiving) “I mean, it was good. We knew it was going to be a battle, like you said. There’s been a rivalry going over decades. I mean, we came in to it looking to win, but we got a lot that we’ve got to improve from this game and just come back battling.”

(On what they did during the first half to keep Drew Brees in check) “There’s just something that we’ve got to go back and watch on film and see what we fell short at, at the end of the day. I mean, you can’t take it from him. Drew is a heck of a quarterback in the NFL. At the end of the day we fall back on what we could improve on.”

(On what Alvin Kamara did to be so successful against the Falcons defense) “Just the ways that they use him. They use him as a running back, as a receiver. Pretty much just as a dual guy. So when you studying guys like that, you have to be on your P’s and Q’s and you have to just study them down to the T and make sure that when you face him, that he gets nothing.

(On moving forward here after this game) “We’re going to move on. This team that we have here, I mean, we have a great group of guys here. We never hold our head down. As long as there’s still ball to play, we going to battle. We’re going to come back on Monday and battle our tails off against each other and come away with a win on Sunday.”

## **WR Julio Jones**

(On putting the game in to perspective) “We have to take care of the ball better. Offensively, that’s about it. Guys, we came out. We fought. But turnovers will kill you every time.”

(On what he said to Calvin Ridley after the game) “That’s just between me and Calvin. He’ll be good.”

(On his message to the team after a game like this) “We just have to keep fighting. That’s it. We’ll see what our guys are made of. When you’re going in to battle, you want somebody to – it’s rough right now for us. You do not want guys to quit and this is the time where you get to see what guys are really like.”

(Mood in the locker room) “We know we are a better team than what we put out there today especially offensively. I can’t speak for defense. I didn’t see what they was doing out there and things like that. But I feel like defense did a great job for us today. The only thing I can speak on is the offense. I feel like we just got to do a better job at protecting the ball.”

(His take on the Saints defense and their performance tonight) “They played well. They stopped us, but, we stopped ourselves. Like I said, we gave the ball away and things like that. We just got to take better care of the ball.

(On his thoughts after not being able to score like usual through the past few weeks) “For me, it is never frustrating. I love football. I love playing with these guys week in and week out. It is just, when you do not get the results that you work hard for and things like that – I just love to go to battle for them.

## **LB De’Vondre Campbell**

(On where the team goes from here) “We just have to keep battling.”

(What’s going on in your mind big picture) “Nah, we’re worried about tomorrow. We’re worried about next week. The only thing we can live for is tomorrow.”

(Takeaways from this game defensively) “I mean, we’re a team. It doesn’t matter how we play. Defensively we lost. We just got to go back to the drawing board and make corrections and move on.”

(On mentality to players that are upset) “Like I said earlier. We just have to keep battling. We can’t turn on each other. We a team. We win as a team, we lose as a team.”

(On the difficulty stopping the running game today) “I mean, it wasn’t difficult. They just made some plays honestly.”

(On if they were more confident playing Drew Brees due to it being the second time playing against him this year) “Man, we see him twice a year so we know him as an opponent. He’s just a great player and he made a couple great plays.”
