THE MATCHUP

Coming off a 24-6 win over the New York Giants on Sunday at the Caesars Superdome, the New Orleans Saints (7-7) will play at the Los Angeles Rams (7-7) at SoFi Stadium on Thursday Night Football. The Rams lead the all-time regular season series 42-34. New Orleans is looking for their first road win at the Rams since 2009 and for their first road win on Thursday Night Football since 2019.

The Saints are tied with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, their Week 17 opponent, for the first place in the NFC South and also tied with three other 7-7 clubs, including the Rams, in the thick of the Wild Card playoff race.

An energetic defense that did not surrender a touchdown for the second consecutive game, dominant special teams and an efficient offense that did not turn the ball over and scored touchdowns on both red zone trips, served as the formula for New Orleans' second consecutive victory.

New York quarterback Tommy DeVito faced a hostile Caesars Superdome crowd after winning his last three starts, as the Black and Gold defense harassed him into completing only 20-of-34 passes for 177 yards with zero

touchdowns and a 72.8 passer rating, dropping him seven times, a season-high in sacks for New Orleans. With a combination of stout defensive play and special teams units that gave New York unfavorable starting situations, the Giants never reached the red zone.

DE **Tanoh Kpassagnon** led the New Orleans pass rush, posting six tackles (five solo), three sacks for a loss of 20 yards, three stops for losses and four quarterback hits. Rookie DT **Bryan Bresee** added two quarterback takedowns of DeVito, while LB **Demario Davis** led the team with ten tackles (eight solo), one sack and two stops for loss, as he reached 100 stops for the seventh consecutive season. On special teams, DB **J.T. Gray** had one coverage stop, reaching ten tackles for the third consecutive season.

A consistent, complementary New Orleans offense converted 6-of-12 third down conversions as QB **Derek Carr** completed 23-of-28 passes for 218 yards with three touchdowns and zero interceptions, as he set season-highs for scoring throws, completion percentage (82.1) and passer rating (134.8). RB **Alvin Kamara** led New Orleans in both rushing and receiving with 16 carries for 66 yards and five receptions for 44 yards.

THE COACHES

Dennis Allen was hired as the 17th head coach in New Orleans Saints history on February 8, 2022. Now in his 28th year coaching and 21st in the NFL, Allen has spent 13 seasons in New Orleans in two separate stints, including the six-and-a-half campaigns (2015-21) as the team's defensive coordinator prior to being promoted to head coach. He succeeded Sean Payton, who coached the team for 16 seasons, including the 2009 campaign, when Allen was secondary coach and ended with the Super Bowl XLIV championship. When Allen took control of a Black and Gold defense in Week 11 of the 2015 season that was ranked 32nd both in opponent net yards per game and opponent points per game, he methodically molded a unit that has finished in the top 10 in both categories each of the last three years. From 2017 to the present, New Orleans is the only defense in the NFL to rank in the top five in the National Football League in both opponent rushing yards per game and sacks.

In his first year as head coach of the Saints, Allen guided New Orleans through the challenge of significant injuries at several positions to win three of their last four games after a Week 14 bye and give up 20 or fewer points in the final eight contests of the season, ten points apiece in the final three.

Carrying over to the 2023 season, Allen has helped the Saints establish complementary play on offense, defense and special teams, having New Orleans currently tied for first place in the NFC South heading into Thursday night's pivotal conference matchup at the Los Angeles Rams.

Before rejoining the Saints coaching staff in 2015, Allen served as head coach of the Oakland Raiders from 2012-14 and as defensive coordinator of the Denver Broncos in 2011. Prior to his first stint in New Orleans from 2006-10, where he served as assistant defensive line coach from 2006-07 and as secondary coach from 2008-10, Allen was also an assistant with the Atlanta Falcons from 2002-05, where he received his NFL coaching start.

Over the course of his coaching career in New Orleans, Allen has coached linebacker Demario Davis and defensive end Cameron Jordan to career seasons. Davis has led the team in tackles in every campaign since signing with the club as an unrestricted free agent in 2018 and has garnered *AP* All-Pro honors four straight times. Since Allen returned to New Orleans in 2015, Jordan's 88.5 sacks rank third in the NFL.

Allen played safety at Texas A&M from 1992-95, where he started the final 21 games of his college career before being signed as an undrafted free agent by the Buffalo Bills in 1996. Prior to entering the National Football League coaching ranks in 2002, Allen served as a graduate assistant at his alma mater from 1996-99 and as secondary

coach at the University of Tulsa from 2000-2001. He earned a bachelor of business administration degree and a master's in kinesiology from Texas A&M.

Raised in Hurst, Texas, Allen and his wife, Alisson, have a daughter, Layla and a son, Garrison.

Named the 23rd full-time head coach in franchise history on January 12, 2017, **Sean McVay** became the youngest head coach in modern history. The Rams finished 5-12 in 2022 after an injury-riddled team forced young players to step up. Those young players have combined with a veteran core in 2023, with McVay having the Rams at 7-7 in the thick of the NFC Wild Card playoff race.

The starts aligned in 2021 as McVay and the Rams went "all in" to win Super Bowl LVI. He finished the regular season 12-5 and became the youngest head coach in NFL history to win a Super Bowl. In 2020, McVay and the Rams posted a 10-6 record, his fourth straight winning steaming and earned his third playoff berth in his first four seasons. During the 2019 season the Rams posted a 9-7 record, the third straight winning season under McVay

In 2018, his second season as head coach, the Rams won 13 games, tied for the second-most single-season wins in franchise history, and competed in the organization's fourth Super Bowl. In his first season in 2017, the Rams won seven more games than the previous season, went from last in the league in scoring to first, and made their first postseason appearance in 13 years.

Prior to joining the Rams, McVay was the offensive coordinator (2014-16), tight ends coach (2011-13) and offensive assistant (2010) in Washington. McVay joined Washington prior to 2010 after an undefeated regular season with the Florida Tuskers of the United Football League. The Tuskers finished a perfect 6-0 before losing in the UFL's inaugural championship game. McVay originally entered the National Football League as an offensive assistant with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

McVay played wide receiver at Miami (Ohio). His grandfather, John McVay, served in various administrative roles, including director of research development for the New York Giants (1976) and vice president/director of football operations for the San Francisco 49ers (1983-94), as well as serving as general manager one year in San Francisco (1998-99). John McVay oversaw five Super Bowl championship squads and earned induction into the 49ers Hall of Fame in 2013.

McVay was born on January 24, 1986 in Marietta, Ga.

SERIES HISTORY

The Saints and Rams have played 76 times in the regular season with Los Angeles holding a 42-34 edge, while the clubs have split two playoff contests. Former longtime foes in the NFC West, the Saints have played only the Atlanta Falcons (108) and the San Francisco 49ers (78) more often than the Rams.

In the 76 regular meetings of the series between the Saints and Rams there has been:

- 1,588 points scored by New Orleans, 1,732 allowed.
- A seven-game New Orleans winning streak from 1990-93.
- Two three-game New Orleans winning streaks in contests played at the Superdome from 1985-87 and 1990-92.
- 41 games decided by double-digits.
- Ten games decided by 21 or more points.
- 34 games decided by eight points or less.
- One 31-point win by New Orleans.
- A 31-point loss by New Orleans.

HALL OF FAME

EVANS SEMIFINALIST FOR PRO FOOTBALL HALL

Former New Orleans Saints right guard Jahri Evans, currently serving as an offensive assistant on the coaching staff, is one of 25 Modern-Era Player Semifinalists for the Pro Football Hall of Fame's Class of 2024. Originally selected by New Orleans in the fourth round of the 2006 NFL Draft out of Division II Bloomsburg, Evans arrived in New Orleans and captured right guard duties in training camp. For his Black and Gold career, Evans started all 169 regular season games and ten postseason contests that he appeared in at right guard, finishing his career opening 14 contests at Green Bay in 2017. He was a five-time *Associated Press* All-Pro selection and was selected to six consecutive Pro Bowls from 2009-14. A 2010's selection to the All-Decade team, Evan's four first-team All-Pro selections are double that of any other player in Saints history.

Adebo also set a new career mark in passes defensed in a season with 11 total after nine weeks of action. Adebo's efforts in the secondary helped lead the defense to force five turnovers for the first time since 2020 regular season finale at Carolina, where the Black and Gold had a five-interception performance.

Senior Offensive Assistant Bob Bicknell - Father, Jack spent 13 seasons as a head coach in NFL Europe. Brother, Jack Jr. served as an assistant with the New York Giants, Kansas City Chiefs, Pittsburgh Steelers and Miami Dolphins.

Offensive Assistant D.J. Williams - Father, Doug, is a veteran of Washington's front office, who won Super Bowl XXII as their starting quarterback, the pinnacle of a storied 12-year pro football career, which includes him being in the Buccaneers Ring of Honor, also working in the Tampa Bay front office.

VP/Assistant General Manager-College Personnel Jeff Ireland - Stepson of Kansas City Chiefs Hall of Fame linebacker/center E.J. Holub. Grandson of Eagles running back and Bears personnel exec. Jim Parmer.

National Scout Terry Wooden - Brother, JoJo, is Director of Player Personnel for the Los Angeles Chargers.

QB Derek Carr - Older brother, David, was the No. 1 overall pick in 2002 by the Houston Texans and played 11 years with Houston, Carolina, the New York Giants and San Francisco. Uncle, Lon Boyett, played tight end for Tampa Bay, the Raiders and San Francisco.

LB Demario Davis - Late cousin Steve McNair was a former standout quarterback for the Houston Oilers/Tennessee Titans (1995-2005) and Ravens (2006-07).

QB Taysom Hill - Brother-in-law, David Nixon played linebacker for the Raiders (2009), Texans (2010) and Rams (2010-11).

DB Jordan Howden - Cousin, Saldin Martin, played with the New York Giants, New York Jets and San Francisco 49ers.

LB D'Marco Jackson - Cousin, Maurice Morris played running back for Seattle (2002-08) and Detroit (2009-11).

Passing Game Coordinator/Quarterbacks Coach **Ronald Curry** - A seventh round draft pick (235th overall) of the Oakland Raiders in 2002 out of the University of North Carolina and played wide receiver for Oakland from 2002-08, appearing in 76 games with 32 starts, registering 193 receptions for 2,347 yards with 13 touchdowns.

Assistant Offensive Line Coach **Kevin Carberry** - Prior to entering the coaching ranks, Carberry competed in training camps of the Cleveland Browns (2005) and Carolina Panthers (2006) and spent the 2005 season on the Detroit Lions practice squad. He also played for the Berlin Thunder of NFL Europe in the spring of 2006. From 2007-08, Carberry played in the Arena Football League for the New York Dragons and Philadelphia Soul and was a member of the Soul's 2008 Arena Bowl Championship squad, starting his coaching career at Chicago high schools in the off-seasons.

Offensive Assistant **Jahri Evans** - Evans was selected by the Saints in the fourth round (108th overall) of the 2006 NFL Draft and spent the first 11 seasons of his 12-year playing career with the Saints. Overall, he started 183 career regular season games at right guard for the Saints (2006-16) and Green Bay Packers (2017), 169 for the Black and Gold. Evans was a six-time Pro Bowl selection, a five-time *Associated Press* All-Pro and was named to the Pro Football Hall of Fame's 2020's All-Decade Team, as New Orleans finished in the Top Ten in total offense each of the 11 seasons he lined up for the Saints, while the 196 sacks surrendered by the offensive line over the period were the lowest in the NFC and second-lowest in the NFL. After being selected as a consensus All-Rookie in 2006, Evans was a Pro Bowl starter and consensus first-team All-Pro each season from 2009-12. He was inducted into the Saints Hall of Fame in 2020, the Louisiana Sports Hall of Fame in 2022, was a semifinalist for the Pro Football Hall of Fame's Class of 2023 and was just announced as a semifinalist for the Class of 2024.

Defensive Assistant **Matt Giordano** - Giordano was a fourth round draft pick of the Indianapolis Colts in 2005 and enjoyed a nine-year NFL career with the Colts (2005-08), Green Bay Packers (2009), Saints (2010), Oakland Raiders (2011-12) and St. Louis Rams (2013), starting 30-of-116 career games, accumulating 202 tackles, one sack, 11 interceptions, including two returned for touchdowns, 16 passes defensed, two forced fumbles, 52 special teams stop and one coverage fumble recovery. He also appeared in seven postseason games for the Colts and Packers and was a member of Indianapolis' Super Bowl XLI championship team.

Secondary Coach **Marcus Robertson** - Robertson played in the NFL for 12 years with the Houston Oilers/Tennessee Titans (1991-00) and the Seattle Seahawks (2001-02) after entering the league with Houston as a fourth-round selection (102nd overall) in the 1991 NFL Draft out of Iowa State. Robertson was an *Associated Press* first-team All-Pro at free safety in 1993 and 1997. The Pasadena, Calif. native finished his playing career with the Seattle Seahawks from 2001-02.

Pass Rush Specialist **Brian Young** - Played in the National Football League from 2000-08 with the St. Louis Rams his first four seasons, who originally selected him in the fifth round of the 2000 NFL Draft (139th overall) from Texas-El Paso and final five campaigns with the Saints, playing in 124 games, recording 22.5 career sacks and eight fumble recoveries. career by appearing in 162 games (144

starts), collecting 24 interceptions, 72 passes defensed, 11 fumble recoveries, nine forced fumbles and 795 tackles (638 solo).

ROSTER ROLL CALL

On the 53-player Saints active roster as of December 11, 31 were on the active roster, a reserve list or the practice squad at the end of the 2022 season. Among newcomers, the roster includes four unrestricted free agents, 14 veteran free agents, six draft picks, one waiver acquisition and four rookie free agents.

New Orleans rebounded from a 26-9 loss to Tampa Bay on October 1 with a 34-0 shutout victory over New England on October 8 with significant contributions on defense that played turnover free football, defense that forced three turnovers and special teams that won the field position battle. The shutout victory was the largest margin of victory in

a shutout at New England in their franchise's history. Including a 9-0 win at Tampa Bay on December 9, 2021 and a 24-0 win on October 30, 2022, the Saints are the only NFL team to have three shutouts in the past three seasons. Buffalo and New England (2) are the only other NFL teams to have multiple shutouts in the past three seasons.

OPPONENT POINTS PER GAME

After ranking in the top 10 in opponent points per game in 2020 and 2021, New Orleans had slipped in 2022 to 31st (28.9 ppg.), going into the Week Eight contest vs. Las Vegas. Since that 24-0 shutout of the Raiders, New Orleans is ranked third in the NFL opponent points per game (17.2 ppg.), moving up to ninth overall to conclude 2022.

BUCKING THE ODDS

The Saints have a long tradition of finding players as free agents signed after the draft that make an impact immediately or developing their careers initially on the team’s practice squad. Several undrafted Saints on the roster play key roles on offense, defense and special teams that the club developed.

Wide Receiver/Return Specialist **Rashid Shaheed** came to New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Weber State in 2022 after being one of the all-time best Division FCS returners and after spending the first five weeks on the practice squad, made an immediate impact, becoming the only Saint to score a touchdown in each of his first two offensive touches. In the Dec. 18 win over Atlanta, he finished with three receptions for 95 yards, with a 68-yard touchdown grab from Taysom Hill, the longest play from scrimmage of the season for New Orleans and the fifth-longest receiving TD by a Saints rookie all-time. On the Christmas Eve win at Cleveland in challenging conditions, Shaheed led the team in receiving with four grabs for 41 yards. In the Jan. 1 victory at Philadelphia, he led the team in receiving for the third consecutive week, posting six receptions for 79 yards, including a 58-yard grab to set up a field goal. Overall, he carried four times for 57 yards with a 44-yard touchdown, caught 28 passes for 488 yards (17.4 avg.) with two TDs, returned 20 punts for 193 yards (9.7 avg.) and returned 14 kickoffs for 320 yards (22.9 avg.).

In 2023, Shaheed is no longer a secret, as he has caught 36 passes for 570 yards (15.8 avg.) with three touchdown grabs, including six receptions of 40-or-more yards, while also carrying six times for 33 yards and ranking second in the NFC and third in the NFL in punt return average (14.0) and ninth in the league in all purpose yards (1,240) despite missing two contests with a quad injury. On Sept. 24 in Green Bay, he had his first career punt return for a touchdown, the second-longest scoring return in franchise history (76 yards). Oct. 1, vs. Tampa Bay, Shaheed had a 29-yard return, making him the first Saint to have a return of at least 25 yards in back to back contests since Darren Sproles (9/25-10/2/11).

Oct. 29, at Indianapolis, Shaheed had a breakout performance, catching three passes for 153 yards (51.0 avg.), including a 58-yard touchdown grab. Shaheed's 51.0 yards per reception average was ranked third in team history as he became only the third Saint to record 150+ yards receiving on three catches. Shaheed also added four punt returns for 46 yards to total 199 all-purpose yards.

TE **Juwan Johnson** led his position group with four touchdown receptions in 2021, converting to the position after playing wide receiver in college and starting his Black and Gold career in 2020 signing as an undrafted free agent from Oregon. In 2022, he led his position group in receiving with 42 grabs for 508 yards with a club-best and career-high seven touchdowns, tied for third at the position in the NFL. Johnson leads the Saints with 13 receiving touchdowns over the past three seasons, tied for eighth among league tight ends.

Johnson leads the tight ends with 22 grabs for 190 yards with two touchdowns in 2023.

DE **Carl Granderson** played in 15 games in 2021 with three starts and posted 24 tackles and three sacks. In 2022, he posted 53 stops (30 solo) and a career-high 5.5 sacks, recovering the first fumble of his career, December 5 at Tampa Bay. In the Christmas Eve victory at Cleveland, Granderson, sacked Browns QB Deshaun Watson at the Saints 22-yard line on fourth down with 19 seconds remaining in the fourth quarter to secure the win. The following week on January 1, 2023 at Philadelphia, he posted two stops, 1.5 sacks of QB Gardner Minshew, one stop for loss and two quarterback hits, as Granderson posted at least half a takedown in three consecutive weeks for the first time in his career.

Earning the starting right defensive end position in 2023, Granderson has posted a career-high 65 tackles, leads the team with a career-best 7.5 sacks, had defended one pass and has forced a fumble and recovered one, signing a four-year contract extension on September 23.

P **Lou Hedley** was signed following the 2023 NFL Draft by the Saints out of the University of Miami, where he played from 2019-22 and punted 206 times for 9,315 yards with a 45.2 gross punting average and 77 inside-the-20. The Australia native, who won the punting job in a competition in training camp at 30 years old earned All-ACC second-team honors in 2021 and was selected as a semifinalist for the Ray Guy Award, honoring the nation's top punter. In 2020, Hedley was recognized with AP second-team All-American and as a Ray Guy Award finalist, as the Hurricanes ranked second in FBS in net punting average. In 2023, he's punted 63 times for 2,702 yards with a 42.9 gross punting average, a 39.6 net and 26 inside the 20-yard line.

K **Blake Grupe** was signed by New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Notre Dame, where he played his graduate campaign in 2022, after handling kicking duties at Arkansas State from 2017-21. In 2022, he led the Fighting Irish with 91 points on 14-of-19 field goals and a perfect 49-for-49 in PATs. The Missouri native was Arkansas State's career record holder in scoring (354), field goals (64) and PATs (162).

In 13 games, Grupe has made 25 of 32 field goal attempts and all 30 PAT attempts to lead the team with 105 points, with 61 touchbacks on kickoffs, ranked fifth in the NFL.

Grupe enjoyed a standout performance in the Oct. 8 34-0 shutout at New England with a career-long 54-yard field goal and a 53-yarder and hitting all four PATs to go with five of his seven kickoffs sailing into the end zone for touchbacks. Grupe became the first Saint to boot two field goals of at least 50 yards in a contest since John Carney (at St Louis, 9/26/04), only the fifth Saint to do so overall and only the sixth occurrence. He earned NFC Special Teams Player of the Week.

On Nov. 26 at Atlanta, Grupe drilled a career-high five field goals, the ninth time a Saint has kicked five field goals, the first time a Saints rookie has, as he scored all of New Orleans' 15 points.

Wide Receiver **Keith Kirkwood** originally joined the Saints as an undrafted free agent out of Temple in 2018. The New Jersey native spent the first two months of his rookie season on the New Orleans practice squad, before being signed to the active roster at midseason and recording 13 receptions for 209 yards (16.1 avg.) with two touchdowns. He added one more scoring grab in the NFC Divisional playoff win over Philadelphia to help the Saints advance to the NFC Championship. After spending most of the 2019 campaign on Injured Reserve and playing for Carolina from 2020-21, Kirkwood returned to New Orleans in 2022,

where he contributed on offense and special teams. In the 2023 preseason opening win over Kansas City, he caught a four-yard touchdown pass from QB Derek Carr. On Nov. 26 at Atlanta, he contributed with two grabs for 21 yards and had a special teams stop. On Sunday vs. The New York Giants, he started and caught a seven-yard touchdown pass, his first scoring grab since 2018.

PRACTICE MAKES PERFECT

A spot on the practice squad is another avenue to eventually get onto the active roster and have the opportunity to contribute. Below is an overview of seven key contributors players on the club's 53-man roster with extensive practice squad experience.

TE **Juwan Johnson** was signed by New Orleans out of Oregon, where he spent his graduate transfer season, following the 2020 NFL Draft as a wideout. Recording four receptions for 39 yards in seven contests, Johnson spent the majority of his rookie season on the practice squad. Con-

verted to tight end in 2021 and leading the position group with four touchdowns, Johnson took advantage of his first full offseason strength and conditioning program in 2022, led the tight ends group with 42 receptions for 508 yards with a club-best seven TD grabs, tied for third in the league at his position. In 2023, Johnson leads the tight ends with 22 grabs for 190 yards and two touchdowns despite missing four games with a calf injury.

After spending his first three seasons with the Seattle Seahawks, contributing on defense and special teams, DB **Ugo Amadi** split the 2022 campaign between the Titans active roster and the Kansas City Chiefs practice squad, also appearing in one contest for Super Bowl champion Kansas City. Possessing the versatility to play in multiple roles, Amadi secured a roster spot with the Saints in the preseason, recording eight tackles, one interception, two passes defended and one coverage stop. He's contributed on defense with one tackle and two passes defended and on special teams with one stop in all 14 contests.

After splitting his rookie season in 2018 between the practice squad and active roster, DB **J.T. Gray** enjoyed a breakthrough campaign in 2019, when he was selected AP second-team All-Pro when he recorded 16 special teams tackles, one blocked punt and one coverage fumble recovery. In 2021, he was selected as a first-team All-Pro and to his first career Pro Bowl (starter), when he led the NFL with 19 special teams tackles (league-leading 16 solo). Gray led the team with 12 special teams stops in 2022, despite missing three games with a hamstring, the third time in four seasons, he has led New Orleans in coverage tackles. He has a team-high ten special teams stops and one defensive tackle in 2023 despite missing three games with injuries. Backed by Gray's performance, leadership and knowledge, New Orleans is ranked second in the NFL in opponent punt return average (5.2).

WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed** came to New Orleans as one of the all-time best Division I-AA returners and after spending the first five weeks on the practice squad, made a quick impact on Oct. 16 vs. Cincinnati with a 44-yard rushing TD. With his 53-yard receiving TD on Oct. 20 at Arizona, Shaheed became the only Saint to score touchdowns on each of his first two career offensive touches. In addition to finishing with 28 grabs for 488 yards (17.4 avg.) with two TDs, Shaheed also handled return duties for New Orleans, bringing back 20 punts for 193 yards (9.7 avg.). He made contributions in the Sept. 10 opening win over Tennessee with a career-high 216 all-purpose yards, including five receptions for 89 yards, including a 19-yard touchdown and a late fourth quarter 41-yard grab to help secure the victory. In the Sept. 18 win over Carolina, he posted four catches for 63 yards (15.8 avg.), including a fourth quarter 45-yard grab. On Sept. 24 at Green Bay, Shaheed had a 76-yard punt return for a touchdown.

In 2023, Shaheed has caught 36 passes for 570 yards (15.8 avg.) with three touchdown receptions, including six grabs of 40-or-more yards, while also carrying six times for 33 yards and ranking third in the NFL in punt return average (14.2) and ninth in the league in all-purpose yards (1,240).

WR **Keith Kirkwood** originally joined the Saints as an undrafted free agent out of Temple in 2018. The New Jersey native spent the first two months of his rookie season on the New Orleans practice squad, before being signed to the active roster at midseason and recording 13 receptions for 209 yards (16.1 avg.) with two touchdowns. He added one more scoring grab in the NFC Divisional Playoff win over Philadelphia to help the Saints advance to the NFC Championship. After spending most of the 2019 campaign on Injured Reserve and playing for Carolina from 2020-21, Kirkwood returned to New Orleans in 2022, where he has contributed on both offense and special teams. He scored his first touchdown in five seasons, a seven-yard pass from QB Derek Carr in Sunday's 24-6 victory over the New York Giants.

LB **Nephi Sewell** was signed by New Orleans following the 2022 NFL Draft out of Utah and appeared in four games as a rookie, contributing on special teams, while spending the remainder of the campaign on the practice squad. Sewell has progressed on both defense and special teams and secured a spot on the 53-man roster in 2023, posting five coverage tackles and one forced fumble and nine defensive stops

Originally a third round draft pick of the Broncos in 2018 out of Boston College, CB **Isaac Yiadom** has played in 84 games with 25 starts for Denver, the Giants, Green Bay, Houston and New Orleans and has posted 130 tackles, a split sack, two interceptions, 25 passes defensed, one forced fumble and 26 special teams stops. After starting 2022 with the Texans, Yiadom joined the Saints practice squad midway through the season and upon being signed to the active roster, recorded two special teams stops in six appearances.

In 2023, Yiadom has contributed on both defense and special teams, playing in all 14 games with five starts, recording 23 tackles, one interception, a career-high 13 passes defensed to rank second on the team and six coverage stops to also rank second on the team, tying his career-high.

On the following pages are a synopsis of several returning players and newcomers through the draft and free agency to the 2023 Saints offensive line:

Right Tackle Ryan Ramczyk - The Black and Gold used their second first round selection in the 2017 NFL Draft to snag Ramczyk out of Wisconsin, one of the best offensive linemen in the entire draft. After opening all 16 games and both postseason contests in 2017 and being selected as a PFWA All-Rookie, he has been selected as an AP All-Pro selection three times since. After missing seven contests in 2021, Ramczyk rebounded to open the first 16 games in 2022 and continues to anchor the right side of the line, opening 12 contests in 2023.

Tackle/Guard James Hurst - A nine-year National Football League veteran who was signed as a free agent from Baltimore in 2020, Hurst has 146 career regular season appearances with 91 starts at four different positions on the inside and outside. His versatility came in handy in 2020, as he started two contests at left tackle and one at left guard, while the Saints gained over 200 yards rushing each time. In 2021, Hurst moved into the starting lineup for eight games at left tackle in place of an injured Armstead, two at left guard in place of an injured Andrus Peat and three at right tackle for an injured Ryan Ramczyk. Hurst started 15 games at left tackle and one at left guard in 2022. In 2023, Hurst has opened ten games at left guard, including the last six contests, one at left tackle and one at right guard.

Tackle/Guard Andrus Peat - A first round selection (13th overall) in the 2015 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Peat was considered one of the top college linemen in 2014. In nine seasons, he's played in 108 regular season games with 99 starts, opening a contest at every position except center. In 2020, he opened 13 contests at left guard as he was part of the NFC Pro squad for the third consecutive season. In 2021, he opened the first six contests, where New Orleans got off to a 4-2 start before suffering a season-ending pectoral injury. In his return to the starting lineup in the 2022 season opener in Atlanta, New Orleans rushed for 151 yards. In back-to-back weeks, Peat was a part of rushing efforts of 200-yards plus by the club for the first time since 2020. In 2023, Peat has started one contest at left guard and the last eight at left tackle as the offensive line has solidified with his return to the starting lineup.

Center/Guard Erik McCoy - New Orleans traded up in the second round of the 2019 NFL Draft to select this standout from Texas A&M, who was a three-year starter, anchoring the middle of the Aggies line. In 2018, he was a team captain who paved the way for the SEC's leading rusher and in 2019 was the first Saint in franchise history to start at center in Week One, opening all 16 contests. McCoy has opened all 71 contests he has appeared in at center and signed a five-year contract extension with the team in 2022.

Guard/Center Cesar Ruiz - The hard-working, talented and intelligent lineman is a perfect fit for New Orleans' culture. He was selected with the 24th pick in the 2020 NFL Draft out of the University of Michigan. The three-year letterman played in 36 games in college, starting his last 31 including the final 26 at center, earning All-Big Ten in 2019. Ruiz settled in at right guard in the last 15 games, with nine starts, as well as both postseason contests. When McCoy suffered a lower leg injury in the first quarter of the 2021 opening win over Green Bay, Ruiz transitioned over to his natural position, where the Saints did not give up a sack in his four starts at center. He returned to right guard on Oct. 25 at Seattle and was the only lineman in 2021 to not miss a start. Ruiz opened 13 games at right guard and one at center in 2022 before suffering a season-ending foot injury Dec. 18, vs. Atlanta. The 46 consecutive starts for Ruiz at the time of his injury was the longest active streak for a Saint. Following an ardent rehab, Ruiz returned to the starting lineup for the season opener on September 10, the day after signing a four-year contract extension.

Tackle Landon Young - A mainstay at left tackle for

his college career at the University of Kentucky, Young played in 49 contests with 30 starts in his college career. The Lexington, Ky. native was selected by New Orleans in the sixth round of the 2021 NFL Draft and held up to the competition in training camp to snare a roster spot. Young opened one contest at right tackle in 2021 and serves as Ramczyk's backup on the right side, also playing *jumbo tight end*. In 2022, Young showed versatility. On October 13 at Pittsburgh, he slide over to left tackle for the second half to replace Hurst (concussion) and opened this the November 20 win over the Rams at one of the league's most challenging positions. In the January 1, 2023 win at Philadelphia, Young played the final three quarters in place of Ramczyk (hip) and then started the following week's finale vs. Carolina. This past Sunday, he opened the win over the New York Giants at right tackle in place of Ramczyk (knee).

Guard/Center Max Garcia - The nine-year National Football League veteran was signed as a free agent at the start of training camp. This versatile lineman has played in 119 regular season games with 62 starts for New Orleans, Arizona and Denver, including opening the three contests at left guard in 2023. Originally a fourth round draft pick of Denver out of the University of Florida in 2015, who started five contests as a rookie for the Super Bowl 50 champions, Garcia has opened 46 games at right guard, 12 at left guard and four at center.

After finishing ranked seventh in the NFL in 2021, surrendering 318.2 net yards per game, the Saints defense returned to the top five again in 2022, ranking fifth, while giving up 314.8 net yards per game. In 2023, they are ranked 11th, giving up 311.9 net yards per game. New Orleans and San Francisco are the only two teams to rank in the top ten each of the last three seasons and this marked the third time the Saints have ranked in the top ten in total defense for three straight seasons (1982-84 and 1991-93).

COVERAGE UNITS

New Orleans' coverage and block units in 2023 are led by defensive team co-captain DB **J.T. Gray**. Signed by the Saints following the 2018 NFL Draft out of Mississippi State, Gray enjoyed a banner campaign in 2021. Voted by teammates as the club's special teams captain for the first time, Gray led the NFL with 19 tackles in 16 games, as he was selected as a Pro Bowl starter and as the team's only first-team *Associated Press* All-Pro. Playing in 78 career games, Gray has career totals of 66 special teams stops, a blocked punt, three fumble recoveries and ten defensive tackles, 2.5 sacks and a pass defense, ranked first on the team with 12 coverage stops in 2022 despite missing three games (hamstring). In 2023, he has ten coverage stops to lead the team and tie for eighth in the NFL, despite missing three contests.

A third round draft pick of the Denver Broncos in 2018 out of Boston College, in addition to starting 25 of his 84 career contests on defense and posting 130 tackles, a split sack, two interceptions, 25 passes defended and one forced fumble, **Isaac Yiadom** has recorded 26 career coverage stops for five teams. Brought up to the active roster during Gray's injury, Yiadom brought a boost to the Saints coverage units with three stops, remaining an integral part of the group after Gray's return to the lineup and re-signing in the off-season. In 2023, Yiadom is ranked third on the team with six special teams tackles, tying his career-high. On Oct. 29, at Indianapolis, Yiadom downed a punt at the Colts three-yard line in the third quarter. In the Nov. 5 win over Chicago, Yiadom played a key role on a punt with the Bears starting field position at their two-yard line.

One of the club's two third round draft picks in 2020, **Zack Baun**, a former Wisconsin standout, has embraced work on the team's special teams units. He has recorded 21 tackles on coverage, one blocked field goal and 60 defensive stops, one sack, one interception and one pass defense. On Sept. 10 at Tennessee, Baun got his hands on a punt that went out of bounds one yard past the line of scrimmage, a game-changing play.

Selected in the fifth round of the 2022 NFL Draft by the Saints out of Appalachian State, LB **D'Marco Jackson** came to New Orleans as the only Football Bowl Subdivision player with more than 200 tackles and 25 stops for loss in the 2020 and 2021 seasons combined. After missing his entire rookie campaign with a hamstring injury, Jackson's hard-working and hard-hitting mentality has proven to be a good fit on the team's coverage units as he is ranked second on the team with seven stops and the fumble recovery for a touchdown.

DB **Lonnie Johnson** was signed by New Orleans as an free agent in the offseason after spending his first three seasons with the Houston Texans and the 2022 campaign with the Tennessee Titans. Johnson has posted 19 career special teams stops, including five with New Orleans in 2023. On Oct. 19, at Jacksonville, Johnson had a fumble recovery off a muffed punt for his first career special teams take-away.

Signed as an undrafted free agent in 2022 out of Utah, Sewell appeared in four games on special teams as a rookie. In 2023, the sure tackler secured a spot on the team's coverage units and is tied fourth on the team with five stops to go with nine defensive tackles and the Dec. 10 special teams forced fumble on a punt play.

The success of the team's coverage units have allowed New Orleans to rank first in the NFL in opponent punt return average.

QUARTERBACKS

DEREK CARR

- On March 6, 2023 the Saints agreed to terms with Derek Carr on a four-year contract to solidify the quarterback position. He spent the first nine seasons of his NFL career with the Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders. Originally selected in the second round (36th overall) of the 2014 NFL Draft by the Raiders out of Fresno State, the Bakersfield, Calif. native has started all 156 career regular season games he has played in, completing 3,503-of-5,406 passes (64.8 percent) for 38,320 yards with 233 touchdown passes, 106 interceptions and a 91.8 passer rating, while adding 880 rushing yards and six touchdowns. From 2014-22 as a member of the Raiders, Carr was selected to four Pro Bowl Games (2015-17, 2022) and set numerous team passing records including the franchise's career passing yardage and touchdown pass marks and single-season mark in passing yards (4,804 in 2021), as the only signal-caller in the team's history with multiple seasons reaching the 4,000 yard mark. He also holds franchise records from his Raiders tenure for multiple-touchdown pass games (69), contests with a passer rating of at least 100.0 (47) and 300-yard passing performances (33).

- Since entering the league in 2014, Carr ranks second in the NFL in completions, fourth in passing yardage and seventh in passing touchdowns. He became the third quarterback in history to pass for 3,000-plus yards in each of his first ten seasons, joining Pro Football Hall of Fame signal-caller Peyton Manning and Russell Wilson. He is just the fourth player in NFL history to reach 35,000 passing yards in his first nine seasons. He has completed 299 passes of 25+ yards since he entered the league in 2014, the fourth-most in the NFL over that span. His 156 starts are the most by a quarterback since 2014.

- Carr enjoyed a successful Saints debut in the Sept. 10 win over Tennessee, when he completed 23-of-33 passes (69.7%) for 305 yards with one touchdown, one interception and a 96.1 passer rating.

- Carr helped lead New Orleans to a 20-17 victory at Carolina on Monday Night Football on Sept. 18, when in the second half, he completed a 42-yard pass to Chris Olave and a 45-yard pass to Rashid Shaheed to set up the Saints' two touchdowns.

- On Sept. 24 at Green Bay, Carr had completed 13-of-18 (72.2%) of his passes for 103 yards with an eight-yard scoring throw to TE Jimmy Graham and a 104.6 passer rating to help put New Orleans ahead 17-0 over the Packers before being forced to leave in the third quarter with a sprained AC joint injury.
- Carr was a model of efficiency in the Oct. 8 34-0 shutout of New England, completing 18-of-26 passes (69.2%) for 183 yards with two touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 114.7 passer rating, his highest as a Saint to date.
- On Oct. 15 at Houston, Carr finished 32-of-50 passing (64.0 pct.) for 353 yards, one touchdown and one interception, also carrying two yards for a first down. It was the tenth-highest passing yardage total of Carr's career and his highest total as a Saint to date.
- On Oct. 19 vs. Jacksonville, Carr completed 33-of-55 passes for 301 yards with a 17-yard touchdown to Michael Thomas, as he became the first Saints passer to have back-to-back weeks of at least 300 yards passing since Drew Brees in Weeks 14 and 15 of the 2019 campaign.
- In the Oct. 29 win at Indianapolis, Carr was in complete control, as he completed 19-of-27 passes for 310 yards with two touchdowns, including a 58-yard touchdown pass to Shaheed, one of two completions of 50-yards or more to the speedster, as he became the first Saints passer to have three consecutive weeks of at least 300 yards passing since Brees did so in four straight from Dec. 21, 2015-Sept. 11, 2016. It was also the first time Carr threw for 300 yards in three straight contests since Weeks One-Three of 2021.
- In the Nov. 5 24-17 win over Chicago, Carr completed 25-of-34 passes (73.5%) for 211 yards, two TDs and a 108.8 passer rating. Carr engineered a fourth quarter, go-ahead, game-winning drive, where he completed both passing attempts for 18 yards,.
- On Nov. 26, at Atlanta, Carr completed 24-of-38 passes for 304 yards with three completions of 25 yards or more for his fifth performance of at least 300 yards of the season.
- On Dec. 3, vs. Detroit, Carr completed 17-of-22 passes (77.3%) for 226 yards with one touchdown and a 105.5 passer rating, as he completed his final 15 attempts.
- On Dec. 10, vs. Carolina, Carr completed 18-of-26 passes for 119 yards with touchdown passes to Jimmy Graham and Chris Olave to help New Orleans to the season sweep over the Panthers.
- On Dec. 17, vs. the New York Giants, despite the absence of the team's top two wide receivers on the depth chart, Carr completed passes to ten different teammates, going 23-of-28 for 218 yards with three touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 134.8 passer rating to lead the Saints to their second straight victory. Carr set season-highs in completion percentage (82.1), scoring throws and passer rating.

- The 2013 Heisman Trophy winner at Florida State and the first pick in the 2015 NFL Draft, Winston has appeared in 92 games with 80 starts, completing 1,763-of-2,882 passes (61.2%) for 22,104 yards with 141 touchdowns, 99 interceptions and an 87.0 rating, adding 1,214 rushing yards and 11 touchdowns. In 2021, before suffering a season-ending knee injury in Week Eight, Winston completed 95-of-161 passes for 1,170 yards, 14 touchdowns, three interceptions and a 102.8 passer rating, ranked first in the NFL at the time of his injury in touchdown percentage (8.7).

- Serving as the backup to Carr with extensive starting experience, Winston has completed 25-of-47 passes for 264 yards with two touchdowns and three interceptions.

• Hill's brought unheralded versatility to the Saints offense and special teams. A constant participant on special teams from midseason in 2017, as well as the backup signal-caller and as a runner and receiver, Hill has played in 94 regular season games with 40 starts at several positions. He has carried 388 times for 2,105 yards, the most by a Saint not to play running back, with 27 touchdowns, tied for seventh in club records, caught 70 passes for 698 yards with ten touchdowns, completed 190-of-296 passes (64.2%) for 2,337 yards with 11 touchdowns, returned 19 kickoffs for 447 yards, made 15 special teams tackles and one blocked punt.

• In 2022, Hill assisted the Black and Gold offense in multiple facets. He contributed on both offense and special teams in the season opener at Atlanta, Hill carried four times for a club-best 81 yards (20.3 avg.), including a career-long 57-yard carry, as well as an 11-yard rushing touchdown on the same first quarter drive of his long run. Hill also caught a pass for a two-yard gain and contributed on multiple special teams units both on the coverage and return teams. Overall, he ranked second on the team in rushing with 96 carries for a career-high 575 yards (club-best 6.0 avg.) with a club-best seven rushing touchdowns, nine catches for 75 yards with two scores, leading the team in total touchdowns, while completing 13-of-19 passes for 240 yards with two touchdown throws and a 146.3 passer rating.

• In 2023, Hill ranks second on the team in rushing with 71 carries for 347 yards (4.9 avg.) with four touchdowns, has caught a career-high 27 passes for 233 yards with one touchdown, has completed five of nine passes for 72 yards with one touchdown with a 118.8 passer rating, has returned a kickoff 18 yards and has one special teams tackle.

RENAISSANCE MAN

Hill enjoyed an all-around standout versatile performance in the November 5 win over Chicago, when he led the team in rushing, carrying 11 times for 52 yards (4.7 avg.), completed a three-yard touchdown pass to tight end Juwan Johnson and caught four passes for 13 yards with one touchdown. With his touchdown reception from Carr, the tenth of his career, Hill became the first player since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger and the first player since quarterback/halfback Frank Gifford to have at least ten career rushing touchdowns, passing touchdowns and receiving touchdowns. Hill has 27 rushing touchdowns, 11 touchdown passes and ten touchdowns in his career and became the second player in

NFL history with at least 25 rushing touchdowns, ten touchdown passes and ten touchdown receptions, joining Gifford (34 rushing touchdowns, 14 touchdown passes and 43 touchdown receptions). Given the historical element of Hill's accomplishments, the Pro Football Hall of Fame has requested several items that were worn and used by Hill in his historic performance that now stands as an exhibit to fans at the museum.

RUNNING BACKS

ALVIN KAMARA

• A talented runner and receiver with a 5-10, 215-pound frame who was selected by the Saints in the third round of the 2017 NFL Draft out of the University of Tennessee, Kamara enjoyed an outstanding rookie campaign. He ranked first on the club and sixth in the NFL in yards from scrimmage (1,554), second on the team in rushing and receiving, carrying 120 times for 728 yards (6.1 avg.) with eight TDs and a two-point conversion, catching 81 passes for 826 yards (10.2 avg.) with five TDs and a kickoff return for a TD for a club rookie record 14 total scores, tied for second in the NFL. Kamara finished first in the NFL in yards per carry.

• Kamara was the first Saints offensive rookie selected to the Pro Bowl since Rueben Mayes (1986), as an AP second team All-Pro (flex), the clubs' first rookie All-Pro since 1993. He was named *The Sporting News* NFL Rookie of the Year and AP NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year.

• In 11 games in 2023, Kamara leads New Orleans in rushing with 161 carries for 630 yards and a club-best five touchdowns, leading NFL running backs in receiving with 68 receptions for 446 yards with one touchdown for a club-best 1,076 total yards from scrimmage.

Only Marshall Faulk (15), McCaffrey (13) and Brian Westbrook (12) have more in league records.

67 THROUGH 70

Kamara in his first game returning from a knee injury in the December 12, 2021 30-9 win at the New York Jets rushed 27 times for 120 yards with a score and caught 4 passes for 25 yards. Kamara's touchdown run in the second quarter was the 67th score of his career and tied him for the second-most touchdowns in a player's first 70 games since the league merger behind LaDainian Tomlinson's 68 touchdowns in 67 career games.

TWO-POINT LEADER

With two, two-point conversions on Nov. 12 at Minnesota, Kamara is now tied for first in NFL record books with Pro Football Hall of Fame RB and New Orleans native Marshall Faulk, needing one more to become the NFL's all-time record holder. Kamara has three two-point conversions in 2023, needing one to tie Baltimore TE Todd Heap for the NFL's single-season record.

ON THE RUN

Kamara finished 2018 ranked second in the NFL with a club-record 14 rushing touchdowns and tied for second with a franchise-best 16 scores on the ground in 2020.

JAMAAL WILLIAMS

- Signed by the Saints as an unrestricted free agent from Detroit in the offseason, Williams is a talented runner who had a breakout season in 2022, as he led the National Football League and set a Lions single-season franchise record for rushing touchdowns with 17. In 17 games with nine starts for Detroit, Williams added on 262 attempts for 1,066 rushing yards and 12 receptions for 73 yards, producing the first 1,000 yard rushing season of his career.

- The former BYU star's talent came consistently all over the field, as well as in short bursts, as ten of his rushing touchdowns in 2022 came from exactly one yard out, tied for third-most in NFL history. A sound ballcarrier, he went 752 career touches before fumbling the ball and became the league's first active running back to reach 600 carries before fumbling.

- Since being drafted by Green Bay in the fourth round (134th overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft, Williams has played in 100 games with 43 starts, totaling 986 attempts for 3,866 yards and 30 touchdowns, while adding 170 receptions for 1,227 yards and eight touchdowns against only five fumbles.

WIDE RECEIVERS

CHRIS OLAVE

• A talented wide receiver who became one of the most prolific receivers in Buckeyes history, Olave played in 47 games and caught 176 passes for 2,711 yards (15.4 avg.) with 35 touchdowns. Olave's 35 career touchdown receptions set an Ohio State program record and ranks fourth in Big Ten history. His 11 career 100-yard games also ranks second in school history. Olave entered the starting lineup in 2019 with immediate results. He helped lead the Buckeyes to three consecutive Big Ten championships (2018-2020) and back-to-back College Football Playoff appearances (2019, 2020). In the 2020 CFP Semifinal vs. Clemson, Olave had a career night, hauling in six passes for 132 yards and two touchdowns in a 49-28 win, securing a bid to play in the championship game. Olave seamlessly integrated into the Saints offense following a standout senior campaign, where he caught 65 passes for 936 yards (14.4 avg.) and 13 touchdowns, tied for sixth nationally, as he was selected as an AFCA first-team All-American and a consensus second-team All-American.

• Following a September, where he captured NFL Offensive Rookie of the Month honors with 17 grabs for a league rookie-best 268 yards, including scoring receiving touchdowns in back to back contests, Olave led the team in receiving, yards per catch and receiving yardage with 72 grabs for 1,042 yards (14.5 avg.) with four touchdowns along with a successful two-point conversion, ranking second among rookies in receiving yardage and tied for second in catches and third down grabs (26). Olave became the first Saints rookie since Danny Abramowicz (1967) to lead the team in receiving, receiving yardage and yards per catch in his first campaign. The receiving yardage total was second all-time among Saints rookies, as he was only the third Black and Gold rookie to reach 1,000.

TIGHT ENDS

JUWAN JOHNSON

- The former Penn State and Oregon wideout joined the Saints in 2020 following the NFL Draft and transitioned to tight end his second season. In 2022, the New Jersey native had a breakout campaign as he appeared in 16 games with 12 starts and finished with 42 receptions for 508 yards and a team-best seven touchdown grabs. Johnson's touchdown grab total was tied for third among National Football League tight ends.

- In eight games in 2023, Johnson has 22 receptions for 190 yards with two touchdowns to lead the tight end corps in receiving. After missing four contests with a calf injury, Johnson's returned to action Oct. 29 and has been an asset as a receiver and a blocker.

FOSTER MOREAU

- This veteran tight end and New Orleans native enters his fifth National Football League season and first with the Black and Gold after spending his first four seasons with the Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders. In his career, Moreau has appeared in 73 regular season games with 42 starts and has recorded 109 receptions for 1,271 yards (11.7 avg.) with 13 touchdowns and has posted at least 30 catches in each of his last two campaigns. In 2022, the former Jesuit High School and LSU standout set career-highs in receptions (33) and receiving yards (420), while adding two touchdowns.

- Moreau got on the scoreboard for the first time as a Saint on Oct. 8 at New England with a fourth quarter six-yard grab. He has 18 grabs for 164 yards to rank second among Saints tight ends in receptions and receiving yardage, with one scoring grab.

JIMMY GRAHAM

• New Orleans’ third round draft choice in 2010 after playing four years of basketball and just one year of football at the University of Miami (Fla.). Graham broke out in his second year with the Saints totaling 99 catches for 1,310 yards with 11 touchdowns and went on to lead the team in receiving for four consecutive seasons. Graham’s production has been among the top 10 in NFL history at the tight end position in all three major categories: receptions, yards, and receiving touchdowns. Graham posts career totals of 719 receptions, 8,545 yards, and 89 touchdowns. His 89 receiving touchdowns rank 4th all time among NFL tight ends, while his 55 touchdowns as a Saint rank 2nd in franchise history. He and Kansas City’s Travis Kelce are the only two tight ends in NFL history to have multiple seasons of 1,200-plus receiving yards and 10- plus receiving touchdowns. Graham returns to New Orleans, the location of his most personal and team success, after playing in seven campaigns with three other teams and is tied for the team lead with four scoring grabs

Graham’s 89 career touchdown receptions rank fourth among tight ends all-time, his 719 receptions seventh and his 8,545 receiving yards eighth.

DEMARIO DAVIS

• This dependable and sure-tackling defender joined the New Orleans Saints in 2018 after spending his first six National Football League seasons with the New York Jets and Cleveland Browns. For his career, the Brandon, Miss. native has appeared in 191 career regular season games with 177 starts for the Jets (2012-15, 2017), Cleveland (2016) and the Saints (2018-), recording 1,316 stops (851 solo), 42.5 sacks, three interceptions, 55 passes defensed, four forced fumbles, seven fumble recoveries and 24 special teams tackles. In 2023, Davis joined Bobby Wagner and Lavonte David as only the third active NFL player with 1,300.

• In 2018, Davis opened all 16 contests and led the team with 110 stops (74 solo), five sacks to lead the linebackers, four passes defensed, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. Davis' abilities to diagnose and tackle played a key role in New Orleans ranking second in the NFL in opponent rushing yards per game and opponent rushing yards per play. Participating in the postseason for the first time, Davis led the defense with 22 stops (15 solo), an interception in the NFC Championship and a pass defense.

IRON MAN

Davis who had never missed a game in his career until December 27, 2021 vs. Miami due to COVID-19 protocols, ranks as one of the league's most durable defenders, while playing one of the game's most physically demanding positions. His 158 consecutive games played streak was the longest in the NFL by a position player and his 79 straight games started were the most at his position. In 2022, Davis was one of three Black and Gold starting defenders to open every contest, joining safety Tyrann Mathieu and defensive tackle David Onyemata. More impressive, he was the only linebacker in the NFL to play in every defensive snap for his teams.

PETE WERNER

• New Orleans selected this three-year starter from Ohio State in the second round of the 2021 NFL Draft. The Indianapolis native finished his college career playing in 47 career games with 35 starts, recording 185 tackles (111 solo), 16 stops for loss, four sacks, 11 passes defended, four forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Werner helped power the Buckeyes to the College Football Playoff championship game as a senior in 2020, when he was voted by Big Ten coaches as a first-team All-Conference selection and a Butkus Award semifinalist, posting 54 tackles, 2.5 stops for loss, one sack and two forced fumbles. Werner made his second career start Oct. 3 vs. the Giants and recorded a ten tackles. With 13 stops in Week Five at Washington, he became the first Saints rookie defender to reach double-digit totals in back-to-back games. He ranked fifth on the team with 59 tackles.

• Werner enjoyed a standout 2022 season, appearing in 12 games with 11 starts at weakside linebacker and ranked third on the team and second at the linebacker position, despite missing five games, with 79 tackles (55 solo), three stop for loss, three passes defended, two forced fumbles and one special teams tackle.

• Werner got off to an impressive start for the 2023 season, finishing second on the team with eight stops in the Sept.

10 season-opening win over Tennessee, one stop for loss and a split sack, his first career takedown. He recorded his first career interception this on October 8 in a 34-0 shutout at New England. Leading or tying for the team lead in stops in the last three contests, Werner is ranked second on the team with 75 stops, a split sack, one interception, one pass defense and two fumble recoveries, the most recent which took place in the first half of Sunday's 28-6 win over Carolina.

S TYRANN MATHIEU

• This versatile, hard-hitting, playmaking safety and New Orleans native returned home, signing after the draft and brings extensive experience to the secondary. Mathieu was selected by the Arizona Cardinals in the third round (69th overall) in the 2013 NFL Draft out of LSU and has played for the Cardinals (2013-17), Houston Texans (2018), Kansas City Chiefs (2019-21) and now the Saints. In 11 NFL seasons, he has played in 160 regular season games with 151 starts and has posted career totals of 755 tackles (624 solo), 42 stops for loss, ten sacks for a loss of 78 yards, 32 interceptions for 427 returns yards, four brought back for touchdowns, 97 passes defended, four forced fumbles, seven fumble recoveries and five special teams stops. Mathieu has been selected to three Pro Bowls, three Associated Press All-Pro teams and the Pro Football Hall of Fame's 2010's All-Decade Team.

SECONDARY

Mathieu came to New Orleans after starting all 16 games he played in for Kansas City in 2021 and recording 76 tackles, one sack, a career-high three fumble recoveries, one sack and two interceptions to earn his second consecutive Pro Bowl selection. With a team-leading three picks and one fumble recovery, adding up to a team-best four takeaways to go with a career-high 91 tackles (club-best 64 solo) to rank third on the team and first in the secondary.

Mathieu's 32 picks since coming into the league in 2013 are tied for second in the National Football League after recording two picks for the fourth time in his career on November 26 at Atlanta. With three interceptions in 2023, Mathieu is second on the team.

CB PAULSON ADEBO

- New Orleans’ third round selection (76th overall) in the 2021 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Adebo overcame not playing college football in 2020 to make significant contributions to the Saints secondary in his first season with the club. The Texas native finished his college career playing in 22 games with 21 starts for Stanford and recording 97 tackles, 34 passes defended and eight interceptions, earning All-Pac 12 honors in both 2018 and 2019.

- Adebo showed his development by opening opposite Lattimore in the 2021 regular season opening win vs. Green Bay and returning a pick 33 yards in the third quarter to become the first Saints defender to have an interception in his NFL debut since LB James Allen vs. Tampa Bay on September 8, 2002. He then added a second pick in the Week Five win at Washington. With a pick in the regular season finale at Atlanta, Adebo finished his rookie campaign ranked fifth on the club with 63 tackles (54 solo), tied for first with three picks and added eight passes defended and two special teams stops.

- Adebo fought off injuries in 2022 and played in 13 games with 12 starts to lead the team’s corners with 60 tackles (51 solo) and added seven passes defended for the NFL’s second-ranked club in opponent passing yards per game.

- Sharpened by an extensive training camp competition, Adebo is enjoying a standout campaign despite missing two contests with a hamstring injury. Following a two interception, three total takeaway performance in The November 5 24-17 win over Chicago that earned him NFC Defensive Player of the Week, Adebo has 55 tackles, four interceptions, 16 passes defended, two forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Adebo’s four interceptions are tied for fourth in the NFL, while his six total takeaways are tied for second in the league with Baltimore Ravens S Geno Stone and Buffalo CB Rasul Douglas. His team-leading pass defense total for the team leading the NFL in passes defended is tied for fifth in the league.

CB ALONTAE TAYLOR

- Selected by the Saints in the second round (49th overall) of the 2022 NFL Draft out of Tennessee, Taylor shook off early injuries to play in 13 games with nine starts and posted 45 tackles (38 solo) and a club-best 11 passes defended.

- Moving to the nickel position in 2023, Taylor has 64 tack-

les and a career-high 12 passes defended playing in the nickel, ranked third on the team and tied for 12th in the NFL.

NEW YORK GIANTS VS. NEW ORLEANS SAINTS SUNDAY, DECEMBER 17, 2023 • CAESARS SUPERDOME SAINTS GAME NOTES

- The Saints defeated the Giants 24-6, evening their record at 7-7. New Orleans is in a tie for first place in the NFC South with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers and faces the 7-7 Los Angeles Rams on Thursday Night Football at SoFi Stadium next in a contest available nationally on Amazon Prime Video and locally on WDSU 6.
- With the win, they improved their record at the Caesars Superdome in 2023 to 4-3 and their all-time home record to 220-220-1.
- They improved their all-time record against New York to 15-17 and their home mark against the Giants to 10-5.
- With another stellar defensive performance, the Saints have allowed fewer than 300 net passing yards in 40 consecutive contests, dating back to November 14, 2021 at Tennessee, the 40 games being the current longest active streak in the NFL and the longest since 52 consecutive games by Indianapolis from 2005-08. After holding the Giants to just 133 yards of net passing, the streak extended to 40 games and is tied for third in franchise history with a run from December 13, 1995-October 4, 1998.
- The Black and Gold defense set a season-high with seven sacks on the afternoon.
- The Saints converted 6-of-12 third down attempts (50%) while holding New York to just 2-of-16 (12.5%).
- New Orleans managed 296 total net yards offensively and held the Giants to just 193 on the afternoon.
- This was the second consecutive contest and fourth in 2023 that the Saints have not surrendered a touchdown. New Orleans is the only NFL team to not give up a touchdown in four contests in 2023. They have not given up a touchdown in two consecutive contests for the second time in three seasons. It is the first time the Saints have not given up a touchdown in four games in a season since the 1991 and 1988 seasons, when they held opponents without a touchdown in five contests.
- The Saints were effective against the run, holding standout RB **Saquon Barkley** to 14 yards rushing on nine carries.
- QB **Derek Carr** finished 23-of-28 for 218 yards and three touchdown passes. Carr had season-highs in completion percentage (82.1%), touchdown passes (three), and quarterback rating (134.8).
- Carr's three scores through the air puts his career touchdown total at 233, surpassing Pro Football Hall of Famer Steve Young for 34th place in league record books.
- His 23 completions Sunday moved him into the top 20 in league history with 3,503 in his career, surpassing former Saint and Giant Kerry Collins.
- Now at 38,320 passing yards for his career, Carr surpassed Dave Krieg for 26th place (38,147).
- With 3,098 passing yards in 2023, Carr joined Peyton Manning (1998-2010) and Russell Wilson (2012-21) as only the third quarterback to pass for 3,000 yards in each of his first ten seasons.
- RB **Alvin Kamara** had another 100 plus yards from scrimmage day, finishing with 110 as he led the Saints in both rushing yards (66) and receiving with a game-high five receptions for a team-best 44 receiving yards.
- With five grabs, Kamara's career receptions total is now 498 and ranks 17th all-time among running backs. With 68 catches in 2023, it is his sixth campaign with at least 65 receptions joining WR Marques Colston (seven) as only the second Saint to do so.
- TE **Jimmy Graham** caught a seven-yard touchdown strike from Carr in the fourth quarter, his third straight game with a touchdown grab. It marks the first time Graham has scored in three straight contests since he did so in four straight from 11/9/17-12/3/17 with the Seattle Seahawks.
- With the score, Graham now has 89 career touchdown receptions and surpassed Pro

Football Hall of Fame WR Don Maynard for 16th in NFL history.

- TE **Juwan Johnson** added two grabs for 38 yards, including the longest reception of the day for the Saints offense, a 23-yard touchdown pass from Carr.
- WR **Keith Kirkwood** found the end zone as well for New Orleans on a seven-yard pass in the first quarter. It was his first regular season touchdown since a 30-yard strike from former Saints QB Drew Brees at Dallas on 11/29/18.
- LB **Demario Davis** led a stout New Orleans defensive performance, totaling a game-high 10 stops, two stops for loss, and a sack. The ten tackles pushed his season total to 102, marking his tenth season with at least 100 stops, seventh consecutive campaign, sixth overall and sixth straight as a Saint .
- With his takedown on Sunday, Davis tied his career-high of 6.5 sacks set in 2022.
- DE **Tanoh Kpassagnon** had his most productive game as a Saint against the Giants, finishing with a career-high three sacks and six tackles.
- Rookie DL **Bryan Breese** also added two sacks of his own and three stops.
- DE **Carl Granderson** came up with another sack against New York, pushing his career-high to 7.5 quarterback takedowns in 2023 and remaining as the team leader.
- CB **Isaac Yiadom** totaled three stops and a game-high three passes defended.
- DB **J.T. Gray** had a special teams stop on Sunday, pushing his season total to a team-leading ten coverage tackles in 2023. He reached double-digits for the fourth time in his career and for the third consecutive season. Gray joins San Francisco S George Odum (2020-2023) as only the second player with at least ten coverage stops each of the last three seasons. Gray also joins current Vice President of Player Development and former special teams ace Fred McAfee (2000-05), S Steve Gleason (2002-06), WR Courtney Roby (2009-12) and LB Marvin Mitchell (2007-10) as only the fifth Saint to have double-digit totals in four seasons since 1989 and joins those five players and S Je'Rod Cherry (1997-99) as well, as the sixth Saint to do so in three consecutive seasons since 1989.
- K **Blake Grupe** nailed a 50-yard field goal and all three extra point tries, pushing his season scoring total to 105 points and joining former Saints kicker Wil Lutz (2016) as only the second Saints rookie to score 100 points.
- P **Lou Hedley** dropped two punts inside the 20-yard line, including one downed at the eight-yard line to pin New York deep in their own territory in the fourth quarter.

(Opening statement) “It was a good team win. All three phases contributed to the win. I thought some of our veteran players stepped up and played really well in the game. I was proud of our guys to come out and play the way they did today. Now, we have to get ready on a short week to fly out to L.A. and play against the Rams.”

(On if this is the best the team has looked across this season) “I thought our guys played well, offensively, defensively and the kicking game, I thought all three phases. There have been a couple other games – New England, whatever—where I feel like we put a complete game together. I do feel like this was a complete game for our team.”

(On playing the entire game with the lead) “It was good. To be able to play with a lead for the entire game, that was good for our team. Our team’s battled adversity and had to play from behind. For this game to start off with the lead, I thought that was good for our team. In third down, we were 6-of-11. They were 2-of-16 on third down. I thought that was a big factor in the game. Our red zone offense, again, we were two-of-two down there in the red area. Some things we said we need to get better at and improve on, we’ve done that.”

(On what clicked this week to have a complete game): “We have a good veteran group, and they understand what’s at stake. They had a good week of practice and went out and played well. I thought some guys had to step up—Landon Young having to step up to replace Ryan Ramczyk. Overall, I thought the protection was really good. I don’t know if I’m going to get any questions about the quarterback [Derek Carr] this week, but I thought the quarterback played really well. Make sure we get that on record. It was an effective game in all three phases.”

(On if this is the best game Carr has played all season) “Probably statistically. 218 yards. No one’s jumping off the table with 218 yards but three touchdowns, no interceptions. I thought the protection, again, was outstanding in the game and gave (Carr) some opportunities to get the ball down the field. 134 (134.8) quarterback rating. I thought he played well, and the players around him played well.”

(On the pass rush today) “Without really getting the chance to look at the tape, it is hard for me to say exactly. I thought our guys did a good job of understanding rush-lane integrity and how we had to rush this quarterback [Tommy DeVito]. When we did get him off the spot, guys were able to finish and get him on the group. I think that’s really been the biggest difference when you look at the last two weeks. We’ve been able to finish much better on the quarterback when we’ve been able to get him off the spot. Certainly, this was probably our best day in terms of being able to get after the quarterback and being able to finish on the quarterback.

(On if plan and approach changed this week): “We had a significant amount of pressure. We had some four-man rush. We mixed our packages up just a little bit. Look, I thought we did some things on first and second down too where were able to affect the quarterback a little bit. I think on the back end, our guys for the most part-- They had a couple of plays in the last two-minute drive where the quarterback [DeVito] kind of extended a little bit and was able to find some guys late down the field. Overall, our ability to eliminate shots down the field was really good for us defensively.”

(On if rhythm exists on defense): “I think momentum is a real thing. Confidence breeds confidence. When you go out there and make some plays you become more confident. Then, you tend to make more plays, which makes you more confident. I thought both sides of the ball had a little bit of that (going) about.”

(On the criticism of Carr) “I just think it’s unfair, my personal opinion. I know everybody’s got the right to their own opinion. I thought (Carr) played really well in this game. Just like with everything else when you play that position, you are going to get your fair share of criticism. When someone plays really well, we need to recognize that he played well.”

(On if the team played with a sense of urgency from start to finish) “Yeah, I did. It was a good game for us.”

(On Alontae Taylor’s personal foul penalty) “I really did not ask. I didn’t agree with the call. I was more expressing my feelings than asking what they saw on the call. It was a big play in the game though, really. When you really look at it, that’s a big play.”

(On Carr’s toughness) “I think he is mentally and physically tough, I do. I thought he stepped up today and made some plays and some throws. Obviously, it was not perfect. There are some plays that

could have been better. I thought some guys made some plays for him, too. There are 11 guys on the field on every single play and nobody does it by themselves. I thought the protection was really good in the game. I thought guys made some plays down the field when they had opportunities too. I thought Derek was doing a good job of getting through his reads and getting the ball to the right people.”

(On the young receivers’ play) “That’s part of what this league is. Young guys are going to have to step up and make plays. I think on the long yardage situation with A.T. Perry being able to catch the ball – Again, that doesn’t happen if you don’t have good protection because it takes a little bit of time to get down the field—I thought he ran a good route, came back to the ball, caught it, was able to get north and south and advance it and was able to get the first down, which was a big play.”

(On how close Chris Olave was to playing) “My plan was see where (Olave) was at this morning. If he felt good enough, I was going to get him out on the field and work him out. As he got here this morning, I don’t think he felt like he was going to be able to go out and do the things he needed to do to be effective. Particularly with us playing a Thursday night game, trying to get him healthy and get him back in for that game went into that decision a little bit.”

(On if the lack of practice went into the decision for Olave not to play) “I wouldn’t say that we’re going to try to make a habit of guys not practicing and then getting out there on the field and playing, but I felt like if he was able to go and he was able to provide something for us, even in a limited role, he was the option I thought gave us the best chance to win.”

(On getting the tight ends involved) “Generally, when you face a team that’s got a lot of exotic looks and things of that nature, it kind of calms down a little bit when you put a bigger grouping on the field. I think that was part of the game plan to see what we were getting. As we got into the game, I felt like there were some things we could do to have some success.”

(On Juwan Johnson and Jimmy Graham) “I thought it was awesome to see him (Johnson) go and make that play. Obviously, the goal line play down there to Jimmy (Graham) from the half-yard line was a big play. I thought our tight ends stepped up and played well in the game.

(On the defense not allowing a touchdown) “We’ve played better the last two weeks. You’re really only as good as your last outing. We need to go back and make whatever the corrections are that we need to make from this game and get ready for a really good LA Rams team.”

(On Keith Kirkwood) “He is a guy that – he has kind of been up, he has been down, he has been back up. He comes to work every single day and works his tail off. He’s appreciative of every opportunity he receives. For him to get an opportunity to go out there and make some plays is good to see.”

(On what went wrong today for his team) “Collectively, just not good enough. Pretty much take any area, (it) just wasn’t good enough. Give them (the Saints) credit. They did well. (They) were efficient in the pass game. We weren’t really efficient in the pass game. The run, the quarterback zone reads where really all of that was going...I think was 9 for 14, or somewhere around there. We couldn’t get the run game going, had a number of sacks (allowed). They were pretty efficient, 6 of 12 on third down and 2 of 2 in the red zone. So, collectively, it just wasn’t good enough.”

(On the play of the coverage team not being as good today) “Nothing was where it needed to be today.”

(On if the Saints did anything differently to defend Tommy DeVito) “They played well. They stopped the run. (They) were effective in the pass coverages. We had a couple of drops out there early that, I thought, could’ve helped us. Overall, (it was) not good enough.”

(On why the stunts from the Saints gave the Giants trouble) “They did a good job running them, and we didn’t do a good enough job blocking them.”

(On the momentum swings in the game in the first half) “Yeah, it was 7-6. Jamie (Gillan) hit that field goal. Again, they did a better job than we did all of the way around.”

(On Tommy DeVito not being able to escape pressure like in the last game) “I think that it’s different. There’s different rushes (each game). Every game is a little bit different. Like I said, not good enough all of the way around.”

(On not being able to generate much pressure today) “They did a good job blocking us. They stayed on schedule. When you stay on schedule, there are better chances offensively. They were. I thought that (Derek) Carr did a great job. (He was) 23 of 28 or something like that. (He) was very efficient (and) effective. He got the ball out of his hands. (They) hit a couple of big ones. They did a good job. Give them credit.”

(On if the message to the team is that there is still a chance for them to make the playoffs) “Yeah, we are all pros. You get ready to play. You get ready to play the next week. That is our job. We will look forward to the opportunity to play next week.”

(On how long Randy Bullock may be out) “No, I don’t know.”

(On what the team would have done had Jamie Gillan had to exit the game then) “We talked about it at halftime. It almost got to that point, but Jamie toughed it out.”

(On if he thought that Gillan could kick) “Yes, he did it in the preseason last year. You don’t anticipate two guys possibly going down. So, give him credit, He fought threw it. He kicked off. We will see where we are at.”

(On when Bullock injured himself) “I don’t know exactly when it was. He kicked the fifty something (56) yarder, and then they told me it was his hamstring.”

(On if the defensive effort was as good as it's been all season) "Yeah, I thought we did a great job in the run game, and then obviously the coverage and pass rush working together was great. We could have had a turnover or two, but overall, it was a great defensive game."

(On if any momentum has been built in the past two weeks) "We are still a confident team and a confident group. When you get to the back end of the season, you want to be able to play well and win games. A lot of times it doesn't matter how you win it, just that you get wins."

(On how the defensive rush helped the secondary today) "Those guys up front are really able to control the game. I also think we have a lot of guys on the back end that make it tough for any offense. If we play like the way we played today, we will be ready for whatever is in front of us."

(On how good Demario Davis has been) "He is one of our best players and one of our best leaders. We feed off of his energy, and he was really fired up today."

(On how him and Jordan Howden work well together) "I think we work really well together. We both do most of the same things, and he is still learning and growing. He is going to be great in this league for a long time, and it is really cool to have someone like that next to you."

(On Paulson Adebo) "Debo is a good player. He is smart, physical, active, and I think he is going to make a lot of plays in this league. He is the guy that we count on to hold up outside, and he has been doing a great job of that."

RB ALVIN KAMARA

(On 1,000 scrimmage yards every year he has been in the league) "I feel great. It feels good to still be able to go out there and be productive. I don't feel any older than when I came in the league. "

(On the team win today) "I think we played a complete game today. Special teams gunned them inside the 10 (yard line). The defense played amazing with Demario (Davis) and Tanoh (Kpassagnon) going out there and doing their thing. Then the offense, Derek (Carr) went out there and played great. We were able to come out with a big win."

(On Derek Carr's impressive game) "He was focused. He was extremely focused all week on the win and it showed. He really played a smooth game and did not try and force anything. That was one of his best games throwing the ball."

(On the offensive identity building) "These past two weeks have been good to go and put a stamp on the game. We put together a lot of positive yards, plays, and drives which help us score in the red zone and execute. We are definitely still building because we have more room to grow."

(On playing with a sizeable lead in the fourth quarter) "Anytime you go into the fourth with a lead like that it makes the game easy. You don't want to back off too much, but you still control the flow and take the game."

DE TANOH KPASSAGNON

(On if he thought the breakthrough was coming) "I definitely saw it coming. We have wanted results the past couple of weeks, and now we got them."

(On what the difference was for mobile QBs this game) "We have gotten pressure on quarterbacks, but we just kept tapping that rock. Eventually it is going to break, and today it broke. We were really able to finish today."

(On Dennis Allen's scheme and chemistry with his defensive line) "We have gotten really comfortable with each other because it was basically a brand new defensive line. Our chemistry has been building, and we just keep on tapping that rock."

(On stopping the run today) "Yeah. It is something we have been working on to try and get to the quarterback more. It is really why we got so many pressures and sacks today because we pumped the brakes on the running back."

(On Zach Baun and what he brings) “He is fast and athletic. It is a really cool thing to see in practice, and he is finally getting his opportunity to get pressures.”

QB DEREK CARR

(On the offense being spread out today) “This game was really split with targets and guys’ numbers being called. With Chris Olave down, it was a game that everyone had to contribute. He is a great player and he is hard to replace, but everyone else’s workload gets bumped up. I’m really proud of the guys that stepped up. It wasn’t perfect, but they were running their routes, getting open, and they were efficient. When they needed to be where I was throwing, they were there. This is what I’ve always dreamed of.”

(On how important this game was for the offense) “It was the validation of the positivity we have been bringing (to work everyday). We don’t just show up on Sunday and play a game together. There is a lot of work that goes on behind the scenes. The last three weeks in the red zone, we have been so much better. We went 50% on third down today on that defense, and that’s definitely improvement. This performance is what we have earned.”

(On how this game felt for him personally) “It felt good, it really did. You always want to put your best foot forward no matter what you do. The hard work pays off, and as a team and an offense, it makes you happy. I just want to win here.”

(On how the protection was today) “It was unbelievable. I knew I was going to be tired after this one. The amount of personnel groups and checks you have to make against this defense is crazy. Ram (Ryan Ramczyk) is down, Landon (Young) stepped in, and Max (Garcia) went to the jumbo spot. There were so many moving parts, and I’m really proud of everyone. They did a fantastic job. “

(What he saw on the second touchdown pass to Juwan Johnson) “They were playing invert. I tried to pump and look him off over to Rashid (Shaheed), and it was great design by RC (Ronald Curry) and Pete (Carmichael). They put that route there because they knew that we would have a hole there. Very rarely does it happen like it does in practice but this time it did.”

QB TOMMY DeVITO

(On why it was hard to get things going) “We were just hurting ourselves in certain situations, some penalties, just not good.”

(On the call to have him checked for a concussion) “Yeah, I guess they called from upstairs and said they had to check me but I felt good.”

(On if he felt the hit was clean) “I don't know. It's football.”

(On the difference from last week to today) “I think they did a good job defensively. Just their D-line just, I guess just watched their film from what happened last week. They're just ensuring that wasn't going to happen again. They did a good job and we'll be better on offense.”

(On what the Saints did differently to slow them down) “Nothing too crazy. We just lacked execution on offense. We weren't good on third downs. We have to be better. I don't think we played with enough swagger. I put that on me because I'm like, I take that personally, as far as playing with energy, playing with juice. So I need to be better with that.”

(On why there wasn't “swagger”) “I just feel like we kind of got in a little bit of a lull at times. I think it just goes with the execution part. But just keep the energy high at all times.”

(On the Saints defense sack celebrations) “I didn't know until you just said it but it comes what you see in all sports everything with someone just does something and something else happens or it's going to retaliate but it's all fun and games, part of game.”

(On the atmosphere in the Caesars Superdome) “Yeah, it was cool atmosphere, I can say that. Obviously first time in the stadium. We anticipating it being loud, so we practiced a lot of loud music, especially that one song that was played. So that was... it was fun in that aspect of the game. But as far as we learned, just being more efficient on third downs. (The) Quarterback's jobs (is) to stay on the field, score points. So I need to find ways to keep those routes going.”

(On the challenge of teams having more film on him now): “I think teams do that to everybody. I just so happened to play some more football, so I have some more film. But the NFL is not easy. It is not for everybody. But it's our job to go out there. It's part of the job description to go out there, be ready to play against what they have.”

(On Brian Daboll stating he's starting next week) “He believes in me. I'm going to continue to try to earn his trust and all that each play that I'm on the field.”

(On how he felt his performance was today) “Average. Two things I want back for sure. I guess I just need to be that spark for the offense and just get us to score points more.”

(On the two things) “Probably the first one of the game to (Darius) Slayton. And then one to (Darren) Waller on the right side in the fourth quarter.”

(On how critical he is of himself) “Very critical. I'm always harder on myself than anybody else but at the same time I'm realistic with myself. I don't want to try to beat myself up over things, but it's all learning experiences. A routine throw that I make 10 times out of 10 to Waller that I missed just cannot happen. So I'm going to beating myself up over that one for sure. But just watch the film, see what we could have done differently if I could have done anything different, then will go from there until next week.”

(On what he makes of the seven sacks) “It's a little bit of everything. I mean at times sometimes it's just the pressure look, sometimes it's a cover sack, sometimes I can get the ball out and I'd maybe just missed somebody. I mean it's all three of those that goes into it, I think I've said in the past just when we've had a couple other sack games just it's not just on the offensive line. It's not just on the quarterback, not just on the receivers kind of a different scenario every time.”

(On how hard it is to be taken off and taken to the locker room before going back in) “There was a little bumps in the road. I'll say just because I didn't get to have my halftime adjustments and all that and just like talk and just reset with the guys. But at the same time it's the job. You get thrown into it you're expected to play and do everything at your best which we got going at times, we just need to be more consistent.”

LB BOBBY OKEREKE

(On how Derek Carr was running the Saints offense that made it difficult to stop) "He's a vet in this league and we didn't do a lot to get him off his rhythm. So, they were just executing. They were hitting their shots; they were hitting their check downs. Run game was bleeding on us. They just played a more complete game than we did."

(On not performing to expectations after a three-game win streak) "It is tough. It is just one game. We have three more left so we'll watch the film from this, get the corrections done and move onto the next."

(On if they felt like they had an opportunity to turn it around going into the second half) "Yeah we felt like we had an opportunity. Defensively we've been talking all week about embracing the challenge and really if we want to put our team in position to win it's got to be on us. Executing, creating turnovers, really just getting that momentum swinging coming out in the second half and having them go down and drive and score, that's not what we need. We just got to do better from that standpoint."

(On having no turnovers today and if they are sometimes just lucky): "Yeah it is just the flow of the game. But history tells if we get turnovers we'll win the game. So we just got to put an extra emphasis on that in practice, get out mindset right about that and we'll get a better result."
