**THE MATCHUP**

The Saints play on the road for the second consecutive week to take on the Tampa Bay Buccaneers on Sunday Night Football as the Black and Gold return to NFC South division play for the second time in three weeks.

The Saints enter the game with a 5-2 record after defeating the Chicago Bears 26-23 in overtime on Sunday at Soldier Field. New Orleans is in the midst of a four-game winning streak, the second-longest current win streak in the NFL.

New Orleans fell behind 13-3 in the contest in the second quarter. But the Saints found new life near the end of the first half, as QB **Drew Brees** led New Orleans on a nine-play, 68-yard drive that ended with a 16-yard touchdown pass to TE **Jared Cook** with three seconds remaining before halftime. With Chicago receiving the ball first out of halftime, Saints S **Malcolm Jenkins** made a third down sack of Bears QB **Nick Foles** to force a punt. Special teams then took over as WR/RS **Deonte Harris** brought the punt back 42 yards. Four plays later, K **Wil Lutz** booted a 27-yard field goal to tie the score at 13-13. On the next play from scrimmage, following an incomplete pass by Foles, Bears WR **Javon Wims** was assessed a 15-yard personal foul penalty and disqualification. Following return to play, CB **Marson Lattimore** picked off Foles and the Saints would boot a field goal on their next drive to take the lead.

At the start of the fourth quarter on fourth and five, Lattimore dropped a Foles pass to take advantage of the more favorable field position at the Saints 36-yard line, which would eventually lead to a 20-yard scoring connection between Brees and QB **Taysom Hill** to put New Orleans up 23-13. Chicago answered with a ten-point run, ending with a 51-yard field goal with 13 seconds remaining in regulation by Bears K **Cairo Santos** to send the contest to overtime. In the fifth period, the clubs traded punts, with Harris returning his 14 yards. Brees then led the Saints on a seven-play, 52 yard drive that ended with a 25-yard field goal by Lutz to spring New Orleans to 5-2.

Including two in the 2018 NFC Divisional Playoff, the pick was the third by Lattimore of Foles. Following a stand-out performance where he filled up the stat sheet with a team-high eight tackles, the sack, one stop for loss and two passes defended, Jenkins is tied for the team lead with 42 stops and has added two takedowns and a club best four passes defended. DE **Trey Hendrickson** leads the team with 5.5 takedowns.

Offensively, RB **Alvin Kamara** leads the NFL with 987 total yards from scrimmage, ranked second in the league with 55 grabs for 556 yards. QB **Drew Brees** has completed 185 passes for 1,898 yards with 13 touchdowns and three interceptions. Brees owns a 73.1 completion percentage, currently ranked first in the NFL and a 106.5 passer rating.

Bowles served as defensive coordinator & secondary coach at Grambling State from 1998-99...Tampa Bay Specialists Coach **Chris Boniol** is an Alexandria native who played at Louisiana Tech and also coached special teams at Louisiana College from 2015-16...Saints Director of Player Engagement **Fred McAfee** played for Tampa Bay in 1999...Tampa Bay Head Coach **Bruce Arians** served as Saints tight ends coach in 1996...New Orleans Offensive Assistant **D.J. Williams** prepped at Tampa Catholic High School and his father, former Buccaneers QB **Doug Williams** is in the club's Ring of Honor...Saints S **D.J. Swearinger Sr.** played for Tampa Bay in 2015 and then played under Arians with the Arizona Cardinals from 2015-16...Saints LB **Alex Anzalone**, S **C.J. Gardner-Johnson** and CB **Janoris Jenkins** played at University of Florida. Jenkins and Tampa Bay LB **Jason Pierre-Paul** were teammates with the New York Giants from 2016-17...Saints WR/RS **Deonte Harris** and Buccaneers LS **Zach Triner** were college teammates at Assumption College in Worcester, Mass...Saints DE **Trey Hendrickson** prepped at Apopka (Fla.) HS...Tampa Bay DT **Rakeem Nunez-Roches**, played at Southern Mississippi...Saints WR **Emmanuel Sanders** and Buccaneers LB **Shaquil Barrett** were teammates in Denver from 2015-18. Sanders was tutored by Arians early in his career when he served as offensive coordinator of the Pittsburgh Steelers from 2010-11 and was also a teammate of Buccaneers Offensive Coordinator **Byron Leftwich**, Offensive Assistant **Antwaan Randle El** and Outside Linebackers Coach **Larry Foote**...Buccaneer Offensive Consultant **Tom Moore** served as running backs coach of the Saints in 1997...Buccaneers TE **Cameron Brate** had a 2015 stint on the Saints practice squad, and also shares a high school alma mater of Naperville Central (Ill.) HS with Payton. Brate and Saints C/G **Nick Easton** were college teammates at Harvard...Saints LB **Kwon Alexander** was a fourth-round draft pick of the Buccaneers in 2015 and played in Tampa Bay from 2015-18.

THE COACHES

New Orleans Saints Head Coach **Sean Payton** has posted a 144-86 overall record (.626), including an 8-7 postseason mark after the franchise had won only one playoff game prior to his arrival in 2006. Payton holds both the club's top victory total and winning percentage. Payton is currently ranked 25th all-time in National Football League record books in victories, fifth among active head coaches. He continues to represent the Saints as the model of stability not only within the NFC South, as he is the longest tenured head coach within the division, but also among the most accomplished within the NFL. Only the Patriots' Bill Belichick (2000) has been with the his team longer than Payton's 15 seasons. Payton is also one of just eight active National Football League head coaches to lead a team to a Super Bowl victory. The others are Belichick, the Seattle Seahawks' Pete Carroll, the Las Vegas Raiders' Jon Gruden (Buccaneers in 2002), the Baltimore Ravens' John Harbaugh, the Dallas Cowboys' Mike McCarthy (Green Bay in 2010), the Philadelphia Eagles' Doug Pederson and the Pittsburgh Steelers' Mike Tomlin. The 2019 Saints edition posted their second consecutive 13-3 regular season record, capturing their third consecutive NFC South title and playoff berth. A franchise-record six players were selected to *Associated Press* All-Pro and a club-best 11 were named to the Pro Bowl. New Orleans won seven games on the road for the second consecutive season. The Saints set an NFL single-season record with only eight turnovers as they ranked second in the league in turnover ratio (+15). New Orleans also ranked third in sacks (51), tied for third in scoring (28.6 ppg.) and ranked fourth in opponent rushing yards per game. Special teams captured first place in NFL writer Rick Gosselin's annual comprehensive rankings. Payton earned a bachelor's degree in communications at Eastern Illinois, where as a quarterback he had 10,665 passing yards, at the time the third-highest total in NCAA Division I-AA history. Payton was inducted into the Eastern Illinois Hall of Fame in September of 2000 and had his jersey retired in a ceremony in September of 2010. He received an honorary doctorate from his alma mater in 2013. Payton was born Dec. 29, 1963 in San Mateo, Calif., and raised in Naperville, Ill., Payton has a daughter, Meghan and a son, Connor.

Named the 12th head coach in franchise history on January 8, 2019. **Bruce Arians** is a two-time *Associated Press* National Football League Coach of the Year, earning the award in 2012 (Indianapolis Colts) and in 2014 (Arizona Cardinals). He is the only coach in NFL history to earn the award multiple times in a three-year span with different teams and is one of only 12 coaches in NFL history to win the award multiple times. He spent five seasons as the head coach of the Arizona Cardinals (2013-17) in addition

to a 12-game stint as interim head coach for the Colts (2012, while head coach Chuck Pagano was being treated for leukemia), compiling a regular season record of 61-37-1, including his first four games in charge of the Buccaneers. Spent eight seasons with the Pittsburgh Steelers (2004-2011) as an assistant, winning Super Bowls XL and XLIII. Also coached on the offensive staffs for the Cleveland Browns (2001-03), New Orleans Saints (1996), and Kansas City Chiefs (1989-1992). Career record: 56-39-1 in the regular season and 1-2 in the postseason. (does not include wins and losses as an interim head coach).

Background: Arians was a college assistant at his alma mater, Virginia Tech (1975-77), Mississippi State (1978-1980, 1993-95), University Alabama (1981-82 with Paul "Bear" Bryant, 1997). He became one of the youngest head coaches in Division I history when Temple hired him in 1983 at the age of 30 (1983-88).

Personal: Born in Paterson, N.J, Arians grew up in York, Penn., and played quarterback at Virginia Tech. He and his wife, Christine, have two children – son, Jake, and daughter, Kristi Anne, as well as a granddaughter, Presley and a grandson, Aiden.

NEW ORLEANS SAINTS - TAMPA BAY BUCCANEERS SERIES HISTORY

The New Orleans Saints and Tampa Bay Buccaneers first met in 1977. New Orleans has posted a 36-21 record vs. Tampa Bay, the club's best winning percentage (.632) vs. an opponent they have played a minimum of seven games against.

In the 57 games of the series there has been:

- 2,015 points scored by New Orleans, 1,094 allowed.
- A seven-game New Orleans winning streak from 2011-2014.
- A 15-9 record for the Saints in games played in Tampa.
- 23 games decided by double-digits.
- Seven games decided by 21 or more points.
- 33 games decided by seven points or less.
- A 41-point win by New Orleans on December 16, 2012, the club's first shutout against the Buccaneers.
- Since both clubs joined the NFC South in 2002, New Orleans has swept the series six times and Tampa Bay twice with New Orleans looking for their seventh series sweep and second consecutive.

WEEK 1: Saints 34, Buccaneers 23; September 13, 2020 @ Mercedes-Benz Superdome – Drew Brees and Tom Brady, the two leading passers in National Football League history, couldn't muster vintage performances in the first NFL game featuring two starting quarterbacks in their 40s.

But while Brees avoided game-turning mishaps with an offense he's led since 2006, Brady suffered some costly cross-ups with his new team. Brady threw two interceptions in his Tampa Bay debut, Alvin Kamara scored touchdowns running and receiving, and the New Orleans Saints beat the Buccaneers 34-23 on Sunday.

"I made some just bad, terrible turnovers," Brady said. "I obviously have got to do a lot better job."

The first of Brady's interceptions led to Kamara's six-yard touchdown run. The second pick thrown by the new, 43-year-old Bucs QB — who left the Patriots in free agency after 20 years and six Super Bowl triumphs — was returned 36 yards for a touchdown by Janoris Jenkins.

"Win the turnover battle like we did, have a turnover for a touchdown, you're a 90-something percent winner in those games," Saints coach Sean Payton said. "Just a lot of things happened in that game that despite how you play, those things can help you win games. The energy and effort I was pleased with."

The 41-year-old Brees passed for 160 yards and two TDs. He did not turn the ball over and took only one sack. His first TD pass was a dump-off to Kamara from 12 yards out. In the fourth quarter he hit free-agent signing Emmanuel Sanders for a 5-yard score.

"I'd probably say I played awful," Brees said. "Certainly, we are used to playing at a much higher level offensively and especially in the passing game. So, we'll get that back on track."

Still, Brees found satisfaction in beating Brady's Bucs.

"Of course, it's significant and it's unique and I'd be lying to you if I said to you it didn't mean a little bit more," Brees said. "I've got so much love and respect for (Brady) and what he's able to accomplish."

"We played against each other in college, for goodness sake, in 1999," Brees continued. "At the end of the day, I think we'd both pinch ourselves if you told us back then we'd have the opportunity to play this long and be a part of so many great teams and moments, historic moments."

Few witnessed this latest bit of history in person, with government leaders and the Saints having agreed that no fans should attend the opener amid the coronavirus pandemic.

That turned the normally deafening Superdome into more of an echo chamber. When Wil Lutz's field goal put New Orleans up 17-7, the squeaking of pulleys could be heard as the net behind the goalpost was lowered.

Brady compared the environment to "a scrimmage."

"But obviously, it counts," he added. "We've got to look each other in the eye and all work harder, put more urgency on the things we have to do."

TE Jared Cook caught five passes for 80 yards for New Orleans, highlighted by a 46-yard reception down the left side that set up Sanders' TD. Brady was 15 of 28 passing for 157 yards and one TD through the first 54 minutes. He padded his numbers in garbage time, finishing with 239 yards and two TDs, the second scoring strike going to Mike Evans with 2:41 left.

Tampa Bay's opening drive was promising for Brady, who the Bucs hope can lead them to their first playoff appearance since the 2007 season.

He lofted a 26-yard completion to Chris Godwin along the right sideline, drew a pass interference penalty with a 22-yard attempt to Mike Evans and capped the drive with a 2-yard keeper, after which he emphatically spiked the ball.

It was a fleeting, triumphant moment for the Bucs in a game defined more, in the end, by their new star's mistakes.

FORTUITOUS MOVES

The Saints saw two players activated from the practice squad come up with big special teams plays. DL Margus

Hunt blocked a 54-yard field goal attempt. WR Bennie Fowler recovered a muffed kickoff at the Tampa Bay 18 in the fourth quarter, setting up a 21-yard field goal that made it 34-17 with 8:01 left.

WEEK 2: Raiders 34, Saints 24; September 21, 2020 @ Allegiant Stadium – After being in control of the contest with a 17-7 lead, the Saints got caught in a hailstorm of a comeback in the desert debut of the NFL in Las Vegas, where the Raiders scored 24 consecutive points in the final three quarters in a loss that dropped New Orleans to 1-1. Despite struggles on offense, New Orleans seemed to be inching back early in the fourth quarter when CB **P.J. Williams** recovered a fumble by Raiders QB **Derek Carr** at the Saints 40. But New Orleans couldn't get past the Las Vegas 47 and Carr engineered a ten-play, 89-yard drive that ended with a 20-yard rushing TD by RB **Jalen Richard**.

Carr completed 28-of-38 passes for 282 yards, three touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 120.7 passer rating, despite being sacked three times.

New Orleans held Las Vegas scoreless on their first two possessions, including one late in the first quarter where DT **David Onyemata** sacked Carr on third down to get the defense off the field. But the momentum quickly changed when the Raiders forced a three-and-out. Carr led Las Vegas on a 11-play, 63-yard drive that ended with a three-yard touchdown pass to FB **Alec Ingold**. The club's then traded touchdowns, but Raiders K **Daniel Carlson** booted a 28-yard field goal as time expired at the half to tie the score.

On the fifth play from scrimmage of the third quarter, Raiders TE **Foster Moreau** had a 31-yard grab from Carr to set up a one-yard touchdown throw to TE **Darren Waller**. Once the Saints got the ball back, their only drive of the third quarter was stunted at the Las Vegas 43-yard line by 35 yards. Following Richard's fourth quarter touchdown, New Orleans would match it with a three-yard rushing touchdown by RB **Alvin Kamara**. On Las Vegas' next drive, Carlson kicked a 54-yard field goal, set up by a 29-yard pass interference penalty assessed to CB **Janoris Jenkins**.

WEEK 3: Packers 37, Saints 30; September 27, 2020 @ Mercedes-Benz Superdome – The Saints battled back from four deficits to tie the score at 27-27 on the final play from scrimmage in the fourth quarter on a spectacular 52-yard touchdown reception by RB **Alvin Kamara**, then stopped Green Bay on downs near midfield to put themselves in position to take a fourth quarter lead. But a fumble that set up a field goal, hurt New Orleans' momentum, as well as three defensive penalties on Green Bay's drive, proving to be the difference in the Packers' win.

In a contest that featured seven different lead changes, New Orleans tied the score on the last play from scrimmage of the third quarter at 27-27 when Kamara took a screen pass from QB **Drew Brees** and slithered and broke multiple tackles for the career-long 52-yard receiving touchdown, also moving into first place in franchise history in multiple-score contests (16). S **Malcolm Jenkins** and CB **Marshon Lattimore** then combined to stop Packers RB **Aaron Jones** on a fourth-and-one near midfield. Following a seven-yard rush by RB **Latavius Murray**, QB **Taysom Hill** fumbled on an option play as it was forced and it was recovered by Green Bay LB **Z'Darius Smith**, setting up a 49-yard field goal by K **Mason Crosby**. On Green Bay's final drive, with the Packers up 30-27 and third-and-three, LB **Demario Davis** jumped offsides, giving QB **Aaron Rodgers** a free play. On it, CB **Janoris Jenkins** was assessed a defensive pass interference penalty at the New Orleans one-yard line, exhausting New Orleans' hopes for a comeback.

Kamara had a huge performance, setting career-highs in both receiving yardage and touchdown receptions with 13 grabs for 139 yards and two scores, adding 58 rushing yards on 12 carries for 187 total yards from scrimmage. Brees completed 29-of-36 passes for 288 yards with three touchdown throws, zero interceptions and a 127.8 passer rating.

Rodgers completed 21-of-32 passes for 283 yards with three touchdown passes, zero interceptions and a 124.9 passer rating. Green Bay WR **Allen Lazard** recorded six catches for 146 yards with one touchdown, including a career-long 72-yard grab. Packers RB **Aaron Jones** rushed 16 times for 69 yards with one touchdown, as the Saints did not surrender 100 yards rushing to a player for the 45th consecutive regular season/postseason contest, now tied for the third-longest streak in National Football League record books.

WEEK 4: New Orleans Saints 35, Detroit Lions 29, October 4, 2020 at Ford Field- The Saints came away with a convincing win against the Lions, showcasing their run game versatility, dominant defense and effective passing game, scoring 35 unanswered points.

The Lions offense put up two touchdowns within the first five minutes of play, displaying an early 14-0 lead against the Saints. The Detroit defense came up with an interception on the Saints' first play, to put them in prime field position. QB **Matthew Stafford** found targets RB **D'Andre Swift** and WR **Kenny Golladay** during their first scores.

Quarterback **Drew Brees** and the Saints offense overcame the two-touchdown deficit, going into the half with a 28-14 lead.

Running backs **Alvin Kamara** and **Latavius Murray** took command of the run game, splitting up touches throughout the game. New Orleans had a total 164 yards rushing, Kamara with 19 carries for 83 yards (4.4 yd avg) and Murray with 14 carries for 64 yards (4.6 yd avg). The run game capitalized in the red zone, exhibiting Kamara's seventh touchdown this season, as well as two rushing scores from Murray.

Brees and the passing offense were consistent throughout the contest, with two stand out targets, WR **Emmanuel Sanders** and WR **Tre'Quan Smith**. Brees threw for a total of 246 yards, two touchdowns and went 19 for 25. Sanders led the team in receiving, during a breakout game with 6 receptions for 93 yards, his season high. Brees connected with Smith twice in the endzone, giving him (Smith) a total of 4 receptions for 54 yards.

The Saints offense went five-for-five in the red zone against the Lions defense, scoring touchdowns on each attempt.

DE **Cameron Jordan**, DT **David Onyemata** and DE **Trey Hendrickson** led the pass rush, each coming up with one sack apiece. CB **Patrick Robinson** forced a critical turnover, picking off Stafford in the end zone in the second quarter.

- New Orleans' defense was steady on all aspects. The Saints' run defense held the Lions to 90 yards rushing and only allowed a season-low 281 total yards, the first time they gave up under 300 yards this season. Surrendering only 36 yards rushing to Lions RB **Adrian Peterson**, New Orleans has not allowed an opposing running back to reach the century mark for their last 46 regular season and postseason games, the third-longest streak in the National Football League.

- Kamara scored a touchdown for the sixth consecutive regular season game dating back to 2019, tying the franchise mark for consecutive contests with a score.

- Jordan's sack gives him four against Detroit, tying the franchise for fourth among teams on his list of sack victims behind the three NFC South clubs.

- The victory improved New Orleans' all-time regular season record vs. Detroit to 13-12-1, increasing the number of clubs they have a winning record against to nine.

- **Sean Payton** now has 141 career wins in regular season/postseason combined, moving him into a tie with John Fox for 25th all-time in NFL record books.

WEEK 5: New Orleans Saints 30, Los Angeles Chargers 27, October 4, 2020 at Mercedes-Benz Superdome- Wil Lutz kicked a 36-yard field goal with 5:08 left in overtime and New Orleans' defence stopped Chargers receiver Mike Williams just short on fourth down to preserve a 30-27 victory over seemingly star-crossed Los Angeles on Monday night.

Chargers kicker Michael Badgley, who missed his first career point-after kick wide right in the first quarter, had a chance to redeem himself after Williams' leaping catch between two defenders put the Chargers on the Saints' 32-yard line in the final seconds. But Badgley's 50-yard kick as time expired bounced off the right upright.

"The young man has been kicking outstanding. He's got to do better but we could have done some other things better," Chargers coach Anthony Lynn said.

Drew Brees rushed for a 1-yard touchdown and hit tight end Jared Cook for a 41-yard score as the Saints rallied from a 17-point deficit in the second quarter.

"This is how you grow as a team," Brees said. "This is how you become battle-tested — and I think it pays dividends."

Rookie Justin Herbert's fourth touchdown pass of the game, a 64-yarder to Michael Williams, briefly put Los Angeles back in front before the Saints (3-2) tied it on Taysom Hill's nine-yard run with 52 seconds remaining in regulation.

The Chargers (1-4) fell to their fourth straight loss by a touchdown or less, and the second in overtime. They also blew a 17-point lead for a second straight game.

"Never thought this team would lose four straight. We've put ourselves in position, but we didn't get it done," Lynn said. "We have to finish these damn games."

Herbert, who was named the starter for the remainder of the season this week, finished 20 of 34 for 264 yards without an turnover. Five of his completions went to Williams for 109 yards and two TDs.

Brees finished 33 of 47 for 325 yards, including 12 completions to wide receiver Emmanuel Sanders for 122 yards, as his 13 career overtime wins a starting quarterback broke a tie with Tom Brady since it was instituted in the 1974 season. Kamara had 119 yards from scrimmage, highlighted by his leaping, juggling catch along the right sideline over the head of safety Rayshawn Jenkins to set up Hill's tying TD.

In Week Four, it was Tampa Bay's Tom Brady, a six-time Super Bowl winner. This week it was Brees — the NFL's all

-time leader in completions, yards and touchdowns.

Brees' dive over a pile of linemen at the goal line made it 20-10 14 seconds before halftime.

Lutz' 53-yard field goal pulled New Orleans within a touchdown in the third quarter. Then Brees found Cook open behind the Chargers' secondary on third-and-long to tie it early in the fourth quarter.

In staking Los Angeles to an early 20-3 lead, Herbert became the first rookie to pass for three TDs in the first half of a Monday night game.

His first came touchdown pass of the evening when he rolled right away from pressure and fired a 17-yard pass down the sideline to Allen.

Herbert's 49-yard completion to Jalen Guyton set up his four-yard scoring strike to Williams one play later. The touchdown capped a drive extended by a roughing-the-punter penalty against New Orleans running back Dwayne Washington.

Chargers S Nasir Adderly's interception of Brees and 39-yard return to the Saints one-yard line set up Herbert's three-yard scoring pass to tight end Hunter Henry, which made it 20-3.

WEEK 7: New Orleans Saints 27, Carolina Panthers 24, October 25, 2020 at Mercedes-Benz Superdome- The New Orleans Saints earned a hard-fought 27-24 victory over the Carolina Panthers with 3,000 fans in attendance for the first time this season at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome on Sunday, Oct. 25

Saints quarterback Drew Brees found a rhythm on the opening possession, driving 75 yards which ended with a four-yard touchdown pass to tight end Jared Cook. The score marked the first time the Saints have scored a touchdown on the opening possession of a game in the 2020 season.

With two of his top targets inactive for the contest, Brees relied on rookie wide receiver Marquez Callaway, wide receiver/return specialist Deonte Harris, wide receiver Tre'Quan Smith and running back Alvin Kamara in the passing game. Star receivers Michael Thomas (hamstring) and Emmanuel Sanders (Covid-19) were absent. Thomas hasn't played since the team's opening week win over Tampa Bay.

Brees completed 29-of-36 passes for 387 yards and two scores. In a standout performance, Callaway hauled in eight catches for 75 yards. The Saints were 12 of 14 on third down and never punted.

The Saints rushing attack, led by Kamara and Latavius Murray, combined for 130 yards on the ground. Kamara also notched eight receptions for 65 yards. After a 16-yard grab in the second half, Kamara joined Roger Craig and Christian McCaffrey as the only players with at least 2,500 rushing and 2,500 receiving yards in their first four seasons in NFL history.

While the New Orleans defense had some struggles, defensive end Marcus Davenport stepped up when it mattered most. Davenport sacked former Saints Teddy Bridgewater for a eight-yard loss with two minutes remaining, knocking Carolina out of reasonable field goal range. Joey Slye attempted a 65-yard field goal to tie the game, but just came up short.

"I thought the sack on third down was critical," Saints Head Coach Sean Payton said during his postgame press conference. "It put them in a much different position. It was a good win."

Bridgewater, who played two seasons with the Saints before joining Carolina this season, completed 23-of-28 passes for 254 yards, including a 74-yard touchdown strike to wideout D.J. Moore.

WEEK 8: New Orleans Saints 26, Chicago Bears, November 1, 2020 at Soldier Field – The New Orleans Saints earned a 26-23 overtime victory over the Chicago Bears behind the leg of kicker Wil Lutz on a crisp, autumn afternoon at Soldier Field on Sunday, Nov. 1, All Saints Day.

Lutz knocked home a 35-yard field goal with 2:12 left in overtime to secure the fourth consecutive win of the season for New Orleans, which is 5-2 and tied for first with Tampa Bay in the NFC South.

"It was a hard fought game," Saints Coach Sean Payton said during his postgame press conference. "I think in the second half we played better football. It's good when you win an overtime game like that - it's the second one this year. There's a little bit of grit and toughness that I think you begin to build. I don't think you just start with it." Saints quarterback Drew Brees completed 31-of-41 passes for 280 yards and two touchdowns. Brees connected with tight end Jared Cook on a 16-yard touchdown strike with three seconds remaining in the first half, trimming Chicago's lead to 13-10 at the break. Taysom Hill found paydirt late in regulation on a 20-yard pass from Brees, extending the Saints lead to 23-13. On the play Brees surpassed Buccaneers quarterback Tom Brady for most career touchdown passes (560 to 559).

Running back Alvin Kamara hauled in nine passes for 96 yards, finishing with 163 all-purpose yards in the contest. New Orleans' first three offensive possessions of the second half started inside Chicago territory. Return man Deonte Harris set up the Saints offense with excellent

field position on a pair of electrifying punt returns, including a 42-yard return setting the Saints up in the red zone midway through the third quarter.

Defensively, New Orleans tallied 5.0 sacks on the afternoon. Defensive end Trey Hendrickson established a new season high (5.5 sacks) on the year with one quarterback takedown. Saints cornerback Marshon Lattimore came up with an interception with 8:34 to play in the third quarter. The takeaway came on the ensuing play after Bears wideout Javon Wims was ejected for throwing multiple punches at Saints cornerback C.J. Gardner-Johnson. Saints linebacker Demario Davis had an opportunity to seal the win in regulation, but a forward progress call allowed Chicago to maintain possession after Davis forced and jumped on a fumble.

Bears quarterback Nick Foles completed 28-of-41 passes for 272 yards for two touchdowns and one interception. Foles connected with former Tulane Green Wave wideout Darnell Mooney five times for 69 yards and one touchdown. Star receiver Allen Robinson had six receptions for 87 yards and a score.

Chicago running back David Montgomery flirted with a 100-yard rushing game, finishing with 21 carries for 89 yards.

Quarterbacks Coach Joe Lombardi - The grandson of legendary National Football League head coach Vince Lombardi, who led both Green Bay and Washington. He led the Packers to three straight and five overall NFL Championships in seven years, in addition to winning the first two Super Bowls.

Secondary Coach Aaron Glenn - Younger brother, Jason, was a linebacker and sixth-round draft pick of the Detroit Lions in the 2001 NFL Draft, playing six seasons with the New York Jets, Miami Dolphins and Minnesota Vikings.

Offensive Assistant D.J. Williams - Father, Doug Williams, is the Washington Football Club's Senior Vice President/Player Development, who won Super Bowl XXII as starting quarterback for the Redskins, the pinnacle of a storied 12-year pro football career, which includes him being in the Tampa Bay Buccaneers Ring of Honor, also working in the Buccaneers front office.

Vice President/Asst. GM-College Personnel Jeff Ireland - Stepson of Chiefs Hall of Fame LB/C E.J. Holub. Grandson of Eagles running back and Bears personnel exec. Jim Parmer.

National Scout Terry Wooden - Brother, JoJo, is Director of Player Personnel for the Los Angeles Chargers.

Linebacker Demario Davis - Cousin Steve McNair was a former standout quarterback for the Houston Oilers/Tennessee Titans (1995-2005) and Baltimore Ravens (2006-07).

Quarterback Taysom Hill - Brother-in-law, David Nixon played linebacker and on special teams for the Raiders (2009), Houston Texans (2010) and St. Louis Rams (2010-11).

Cornerback Janoris Jenkins - Cousin, Pernell McPhee plays linebacker for the Ravens (2011-14, 2019-present) and also played for the Bears (2015-17) and Washington (2018).

Linebacker Kaden Elliss - Father, Luther was a former first round draft pick of the Detroit Lions in 1995 and played ten years in the NFL and was selected to two Pro Bowls.

Defensive end Cameron Jordan - Father, Steve, had a 13-year career at tight end for the Minnesota Vikings, with six Pro Bowl selections, being inducted into their Ring of Honor.

Tackle/Guard Andrus Peat - Father, Todd, played six NFL seasons with the Cardinals and the Raiders.

Wide Receiver Michael Thomas - Uncle, Keyshawn Johnson, is a former wide receiver who was the first overall pick in the 1996 NFL Draft by the Jets, spending 11 seasons in the National Football League with the Jets, Tampa Bay Buccaneers, Dallas Cowboys and Carolina Panthers, earning three Pro Bowls and the Super Bowl XXXVII title.

Defensive Tackle Shy Tuttle - Uncle, Perry Tuttle played wide receiver on Clemson's national championship team in 1981, who was a first round pick of the Buffalo Bills in 1982 and then played three National Football League seasons with the Bills, Atlanta Falcons and Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

Area Scout Scott Campbell - Late father, Marion Campbell, played for the 49ers (1954-55) and the Eagles (1956-61) as one of the league's last two way players along the line as a two-time Pro Bowl selection and first-team All-Pro in 1960, was a longtime defensive assistant with the Patriots (1962-63), Vikings (1964-66), Rams (1967-68), Eagles (1977-82) and Atlanta Falcons (1969-74) and was former head coach of the Eagles (1983-85) and Falcons (1987-89).

Area Scout Joey Vitt - Father, Joe Vitt, is a longtime National Football League assistant coach, who served as assistant head coach/linebackers of the Saints from 2006-16, is currently assistant head coach/inside linebackers of the Jets and also had coaching stints with the Seattle Seahawks, Colts, Los Angeles/St. Louis Rams and Kansas City Chiefs.

Combine Scout Matt Phillips - Father, Ted is the president/CEO of the Chicago Bears.

Secondary Coach **Aaron Glenn** - The 12th overall pick of the New York Jets in the 1994 NFL Draft out of Texas A&M and started 176 of 205 games with New York, the Texans, Dallas Cowboys, Jaguars and Saints and was a three-time Pro Bowl selection. Glenn recorded 41 interceptions with six brought back for touchdowns, adding a kick return score.

Defensive Assistant **Michael Wilhoite** - Played six seasons (2012-17) in the National Football League, six with this the San Francisco 49ers and his final campaign with the Seattle Seahawks. Played in 79 career games with 45 starts and posted totals of 316 tackles, four interceptions, nine passes defensed, two forced fumbles, one fumble recovery and 40 special teams stops.

Pass Rush Specialist **Brian Young** - Played in the National Football League from 2000-08 with the St. Louis Rams his first four seasons, who originally selected him in the fifth round of the 2000 NFL Draft (139th overall) from Texas-El Paso and final five campaigns with the Saints, playing in 124 games, recording 22.5 career sacks and eight fumble recoveries.

OWNING THE MONTH

After the October 25 27-24 victory over the Panthers, the Saints closed out a 3-0 October for 2020 and are on a 15-game winning streak for the month overall, dating to a 25-20 win over the Seattle Seahawks on October, 30-2016. Payton has posted a 40-13 record in the month of October, dating back to his first season in 2006. New Orleans has also won 17 consecutive home games in the month of October, a streak dating back to a 20-10 victory over the Pittsburgh Steelers on October 31, 2010.

November has also been a successful month for New Orleans in recent years as they have posted a 10-3 mark in the month since 2017 including Sunday's overtime win at Chicago.

ON THIS DATE IN SAINTS HISTORY

The New Orleans Saints have posted a 5-2 record in contests played on November 8, the date of their Sunday night meeting at the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. The first victory on the date is among the most well-known wins in the franchise record books, while 1987, 1992 and 2009 wins spurred further success towards the club's postseason goals.

November 8

1970 - The Saints defeat the Detroit Lions 19-17 at Tulane Stadium on the strength of K Tom Dempsey's 63-yard field goal, setting an NFL record which stood for over 40 years.

1981 - The Saints defeat the Los Angeles Rams 21-13 at Anaheim Stadium.

1987 - The Saints defeat the Rams 31-14 at Anaheim Stadium, their second straight win in the infancy of a nine-game winning streak to end a campaign with their first winning season and first playoff appearance.

1992 - A 31-14 win over the New England Patriots at Foxboro Stadium improved New Orleans to 7-2.

1998 - New Orleans fell to a Minnesota 31-24 at the Metrodome in a contest that was at the time the second in franchise history for New Orleans to score an offensive, defensive and special teams touchdown in the same contest.

2009 - New Orleans defeats Carolina 30-20 in the Superdome to improve to 8-0.

2015 - The Saints fall to the Tennessee Titans 34-28 in overtime.

SAINTS TEAM CAPTAINS

In a player vote, safety Malcolm Jenkins was added as a defensive team captain in his return to the team for the 2020 season, with the other six returning captains all re-elected. Quarterback Drew Brees is a 14-time offensive team captain, punter Thomas Morstead has been a team captain since 2013 and defensive end Cameron Jordan since 2015. Left tackle Terron Armstead, linebackers Demario Davis (defensive) and Craig Robertson (special teams) round out the group.

BUCKING THE ODDS

The Saints have a long tradition of finding players as free agents signed after the draft that make an impact.

Ahead is a synopsis of several returning players and newcomers through the draft and free agency to the 2020 Saints offensive line:

Left Tackle Terron Armstead - The club's first third round draft choice in 2013 out of Arkansas-Pine Bluff, Armstead impressed scouts by running the fastest 40-yard dash time (4.71) by an offensive lineman in the history of the NFL Scouting Combine. He's opened 78 regular season games and seven postseason contests and has been selected to the Pro Bowl the past two seasons, as well as being selected as the club's 2019 Man of the Year and the team nominee for the NFL's Art Rooney Sportsmanship Award. Armstead has opened all seven contests this season for a unit tied for surrendering the second-fewest takedowns.

Tackle/Guard Andrus Peat - A first round selection (13th overall) in the 2015 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Peat was considered one of the top college offensive linemen in 2014. In his first six seasons, Peat's played in 68 games with 63 starts, opening a contest at every position except center. He opened ten contests at left guard in 2019, returning to action in Week 17 after missing five contests, being named to the Pro Bowl for the second consecutive season.

Center/Guard Nick Easton - Originally signed as an undrafted free agent by the Baltimore Ravens out of Harvard, Easton developed into a starting swing guard/center by his second season and opened 18 contests for Minnesota. The North Carolina native signed with New Orleans in 2019 to provide interior depth and started five consecutive contests at left guard in place of an injured Peat, the final four where the Saints surrendered only three takedowns. Easton has started four games at right guard and one at left guard in 2020.

Right Tackle Ryan Ramczyk - The Black and Gold used their second first round selection in the 2017 NFL Draft to snag Ramczyk out of Wisconsin, viewed by many as one of the best linemen in the entire draft. After opening all 16 games and both postseason contests in 2017 and being selected as a PFWA All-Rookie, he was an AP All-Pro selection at right tackle in 2018, not missing an offensive snap in both postseason contests and all 15 regular games at the right tackle position that he played in. Ramczyk opened all 16 regular season games in 2019 to serve as a dominating bookend to Armstead, earning first-team All-Pro honors.

Center/Guard Erik McCoy - New Orleans traded up in the second round of the 2019 NFL Draft to select this standout from Texas A&M, who was a three-year starter, anchoring the middle of the Aggies offensive line. In 2018, he was a team captain who paved the way for the SEC's leading rusher and in 2019 was the first Saint in franchise history to start at center in Week One, as he ably replaced the retired Max Unger, opening all 16 regular season contests. McCoy has opened the first seven contests in 2020. He has not missed an offensive snap.

Guard/Center Cesar Ruiz - The hard-working, talented and intelligent lineman is a perfect fit for New Orleans' culture with the 24th pick in the 2020 NFL Draft out of the University of Michigan. The three-year letterman played in 36 games in his college career, starting his last 31 including the final 26 at center, earning All-Big Ten as a junior in

2019. Ruiz has played at right guard in the last six games, with three starts including in Sunday's overtime win at Chicago, when the Black and Gold gave up only one sack..

Guard/Tackle Derrick Kelly II - This 6-5, 320 pound former four-year starter on the Florida State line was signed as an undrafted free agent in 2019, possessing the flexibility to play both tackle and guard. After spending his rookie season on the practice squad, Kelly increased strength in the 2020 offseason and made big strides in training camp, securing a roster spot and serving as a jumbo tight end, as well as a contributor on special teams.

Tackle/Guard James Hurst - A seven-year NFL veteran who was signed as an unrestricted free agent from Baltimore in 2020, Hurst has 93 career regular season starts at three different positions on the inside and outside.

Offensive Lineman Ethan Greenidge - A mainstay at left tackle for his entire college career at Villanova, Greenidge started 43 contests for the Wildcats. The Long Island, N.Y. native was signed by New Orleans as a free agent after the 2019 NFL Draft and after adjusting to the physical and mental rigors of the pro game in 2019, he has appeared in five contests in 2020.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

DEFENSIVE DRAFTS

Over the last six NFL Drafts from 2015-20, New Orleans has shown a commitment to improving the defense, spending 18-of-32 picks on that side of the ball. With nine picks in the 2015 NFL Draft, the Saints picked six defensive players, the most taken since New Orleans chose nine defensive players in a 12-round selection meeting in 1990. Below is an overview of the players selected by New Orleans from 2015-20 on the 53-man roster:

Linebacker Alex Anzalone, Florida (D3b-17) - Selected in the third round (76th overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft, Anzalone posted 53 tackles as a senior through the first eight games before suffering a forearm injury. Anzalone enjoyed a breakout campaign in 2018, when he played in all 16 games and finished with 59 tackles, two sacks, an interception and three forced fumbles. Fully recovered from a shoulder injury that limited him to two games in 2019, Anzalone returns to the starting lineup in 2020 after a successful rehab and has posted 30 tackles (15 solo) through seven contests.

Linebacker Zack Baun, Wisconsin (D3a-20) - Selected in the third round (74th overall) of the 2020 NFL Draft, Baun finished his college career with 154 tackles, 15 sacks, two interceptions, one returned for a touchdown, six passes defended, three forced fumbles and a fumble recovery. The Saints were attracted to his playmaking ability that he displayed for the Badgers in 2019, when he ranked second in the Big Ten with a 19.5 stops for loss and 12 sacks (second among Power Five linebackers in both categories). Baun's contributed on special teams and defense the last six contests posting three defensive stops and three coverage tackles.

Defensive Back C.J. Gardner-Johnson, Florida (D4-19) - Possessing a combination of instincts and speed, this Florida native was a solid value in the fourth round after playing in all 13 games with 12 starts for the Gators in 2018, when he posted 71 tackles, three sacks and four interceptions with two brought back for touchdowns. Gardner-Johnson appeared in all 16 contests with seven starts in 2019, recording 46 tackles (35 solo), one interception, eight passes defended, one forced fumble, one fumble recovery and three special teams stops, adding three stops and a pass defense in the playoff game. He ranks third on the team with 38 stops (34 solo) in 2020.

Defensive End Trey Hendrickson, Florida Atlantic (D3c-17) - This third round draft choice in the 2017 NFL Draft (103rd overall) out of Florida Atlantic brought his raw talent, size, strength and speed to a youthful Saints defensive line. Hendrickson was ranked third on the team with a career-high 4.5 sacks in 2019, adding one more takedown in the postseason. Hendrickson picked up where he left off in 2020, leading the team with a career-high 5.5 sacks.

CB Marshon Lattimore, Ohio State (D1a-17) - The 11th overall selection in the 2017 NFL draft out of Ohio State and the first corner taken possesses all the traits of a lockdown defender. With his agile, fluid style, Lattimore has the ability to shut down the best wide receivers. For the 2017 season, he finished with 53 stops, five picks, to lead NFL rookies and the Saints, tying a team rookie record, a club-best 18 passes defended, a forced fumble and a recovery. Lattimore was the first Saints corner selected to the Pro Bowl since 1995 and was selected as AP Defensive Rookie of the Year. His five takeaways (two interceptions and three fumble recoveries) in 2018 led the team, adding two more picks in the NFC Divisional Playoff win. In the Sept. 22 win at Seattle, Lattimore led New Orleans with a career-high 12 tackles (career-high ten solo). For his efforts in 2019, Lattimore was selected to his second Pro Bowl after

posting a club-best 14 passes defended. He leads the cornerbacks with 35 tackles, one interception and two passes defended.

Defensive Tackle David Onyemata, Manitoba (D4-16) - Possessing a unique combination of size and speed, this Nigeria native had an impressive rookie year after becoming the first player from the University of Manitoba to be drafted into the NFL. Despite being new to football, the 2016 fourth round draft pick became a critical member on the interior of the Saints defensive front in 2017, playing in all 16 games with six starts, making 40 tackles and two sacks. Onyemata had a career-high 4.5 sacks in 2018, including a single-game career best three takedowns in at Dallas/ Onyemata provided a punch for the Saints defense, having started all 15 games that he has played in and recording 32 stops and three sacks to tie for fourth on the team, while being a key run-stopping cog to the NFL's fourth-ranked rush defense, being re-signed to a three-year contract in the offseason. Onyemata has three sacks.

Defensive End Marcus Davenport, Texas-San Antonio (D1-18) - Davenport joined the Saints with the 14th overall pick in the 2018 NFL Draft after showing potential and production as a pass rusher at Texas-San Antonio. In four seasons, Davenport posted 22 sacks, including 8.5 in 2017 when he captured Conference USA Defensive Player of the Year. Davenport's strength on the line is a valuable asset for the Saints front, playing an important role in the club's packages in 2018, recording 4.5 sacks. Davenport posted six sacks in 13 games. After missing the first four games with injuries in 2020, he returned in Week Five and has made a big impact in the front. In Week Seven, his sack of Carolina QB Teddy Bridgewater in the fourth quarter forced an unsuccessful 65-yard field goal attempt. He added a split sack in Sunday's week eight overtime win at Chicago.

Safety Marcus Williams, Utah (D2-17) - A three-year starter at the University of Utah, Williams was twice named All-Pac 12 and earned second-team All-American as a junior when he tied for second in the conference with five interceptions. The defender boasts a dangerous mix of speed, fluidity, and instinct that allows him to read offenses and make breaks on the football. His athleticism showed in his rookie season in as he made 70 tackles, four interceptions and six passes defended, adding ten more stops (seven solo) and another pick in the postseason. In 2019, he played in all 15 games with 14 starts, posting 52 tackles (35 solo), the team-high four picks, tied for eighth in the National Football League, 13 passes defended, a forced fumble and two coverage stops. In 2020, he has 29 stops, two passes defended and one pick.

Cornerback P.J. Williams, Florida State (D3b-15) - Williams' career was initially limited by missing all but two games his first two seasons with a hamstring injury (2015) and a concussion (2016), but he's rebounded to miss only one game with injury since. An experienced starter from Florida State, who developed into one of the nation's top cover corners, in 2019, he made 41 stops, a sack, an interception, three passes defended and one special teams stop, serving as the team's nickel corner for the second straight season. In the Dec. 22, 2019 win at Tennessee, Williams further showed his versatility by making the switch to safety after Marcus Williams was forced to depart with a groin injury and then starting in Williams' place in the regular season finale at Carolina. Williams was re-signed in the offseason by the club, and has posted 12 tackles, one fumble recovery and three special teams stops in six contests, seeing action at both cornerback and safety with one start.

Defensive Tackle Sheldon Rankins, Louisville (D1-16) - Selected 12th overall in the first round of the 2016 NFL Draft, the Georgia native played in 46 games along the line at Louisville from 2012-15, producing 133 total tackles, 31.5 tackles for loss and 18 sacks. In 2018, Rankins ranked second on the Saints with eight sacks, posting 42 stops and a forced fumble. Rankins ardently rehabilitated from a ruptured Achilles tendon suffered in the NFC Divisional Playoff and returned to the field in 2019. Stronger in 2020, he has played in every contest and posted 11.5 tackles, 1.5 sack and three tackles for loss as a key member of the club's interior rotation.

STOPPING THE RUN

In rush defense, the Saints gave up only 80.2 net yards per game in 2018, second in the NFL after giving up 129.4 per game in 2017. The 2019 Saints finished ranked fourth in the NFL in opponent rushing yards per game (91.3). 2018-19 marked only the second time they did so in back-to-back seasons in franchise history, joining the 1986—1987 teams. The 2020 Saints are ranked third in the NFL in opponent rushing yards per game.

The Saints produced their most impressive run-stopping effort in several seasons in 2018 and carried it over in 2019. In seven straight games in 2018, they didn't surrender 100 rushing yards to an opponent for the first time since 2007. Below are the longest streaks in team history the defense has gone without surrendering 100 yards. New Orleans hasn't allowed a 100-yard rusher in a club-record 50 straight games (regular season and postseason), tied for the second-longest streak in NFL history. In holding Panthers RB Mike Davis to 12 yards on October 27, New Orleans' efforts produced dominant results as his rushing total was the lowest for a leading rusher in a contest for an opponent during this streak. If the Saints keep Tampa Bay's individual rushers under 100 yards on Sunday night, they will move into a tie for with the 1972-76 Dallas Cowboys for the longest stretch in NFL record books.

Between deep touchdown passes and athletic interceptions, players often use their hands to produce the game's flashiest plays. However, players using their feet make the difference between winning and losing, drilling clutch field goals or flipping the field with a well-executed punt.

K **Wil Lutz** went undrafted in 2016, joining the Ravens for training camp. Prior to the start of the regular season, Lutz joined the Black and Gold and immediately took on placekicking and kickoff duties. Lutz has kicked in 71 games, converting 134-of-152 field goal attempts (88.2 percent) and 219-of-225 PATs. He's recorded 269 touchbacks. His 88.2 percent field goal percentage is best among kickers with at least 50 made field goals in team history. Until the 2018 regular season finale, he'd kicked a field goal in a club-record 36 consecutive games, second-longest streak in NFL history

With his first field goal on Oct. 20, 2019 at Chicago, Lutz set the NFL record for consecutive road field goals.

Thomas Morstead was the first punter drafted by the Saints since 1984. The club's fifth round draft choice (164th overall) in 2009 from Southern Methodist University, Morstead's been a weapon in the field position game with his strong leg and outstanding placement abilities. In 12 seasons, he has a gross average of 46.6 on 654 punts with a 41.5 net and 240 punts inside the 20-yard line, while also booming 259 kickoffs in the end zone for touchbacks. SWISS ARMY KNIFE

QB **Taysom Hill**, in his fourth season with the club, has brought unheralded versatility to the Saints on offense and special teams. A participant on virtually every special teams unit except field goal and PAT, as well as the back-up signal-caller and as a runner and receiver on offense, in 2018, Hill averaged 24.9 yards per return on 14 kickoff returns, had six coverage stops to rank second on the team, completed a ten-yard pass on a fake punt in Week Four and blocked a punt, Dec. 9 at Tampa Bay. Overall, Hill carried 37 times for 196 yards (5.3 avg.), ranked third on the team, with two touchdowns and completed three of seven passes for 64 yards. The blocked punt earned him Week 14 NFC Special Teams Player of the Week honors. In the 2018 postseason, he caught a touchdown, made a special teams tackle and executed a successful fake punt.

In 2019, Hill appeared in every contest, carrying 27 times for 156 yards (5.8 avg.) with one touchdown, catching 19 passes for 234 yards with six touchdowns, deflecting a punt, returning one kickoff for 12 yards and posting two coverage stops. He ranked third on the club in total touchdowns and third in receiving touchdowns. After a multi-threat performance on Thanksgiving night at Atlanta, when he deflected a punt and caught and rushed for a touchdown. Hill became the first NFL quarterback to both rush for and catch a touchdown in the same contest since Chicago's Jim McMahon in 1983. In a valiant postseason effort vs. Minnesota, Hill led the team in rushing with four carries for 50 yards, caught two passes for 25 yards with a TD and completed a 50-yard pass to Deonte Harris.

In 2020, Hill has continued to contribute on multiple facets on offense and special teams, completing two of three passes for 38 yards, rushing 19 times for 87 yards with one touchdown, catching five passes for 53 yards with one touchdown. and playing on several special teams units. In the Oct. 12 win over the Chargers, his nine-yard rushing touchdown in the fourth quarter tied the score for the first time in the eventual come-from-behind victory. Hill added his first receiving touchdown of 2020, a 20-yard grab in Sunday's overtime win at Chicago.

COVERAGE/BLOCK UNITS

New Orleans' coverage units have been led the past three seasons by LB **Craig Robertson**, DB **J.T. Gray**, Hill and DB **Justin Hardee Sr.**

Hardee led the team with nine stops and a blocked punt

recovered for a touchdown as a rookie in 2017. In 2018, Hardee led the team with a career-high ten stops, with Hill ranked second with six. He posted five tackles in 2019 and leads the club with six stops in 2020 as New Orleans ranks fourth in the NFL in opponent punt return average (5.2) and second in opponent kickoff return average (16.5).

Robertson, one of the club's special teams captains, also made a big play in the November. 4, 2019 win over the Los Angeles Rams when he stopped Rams holder Johnny Hekker short of the first down marker on a fake field goal attempt. He did the same on Dec. 23, 2018 vs. Pittsburgh in a crucial fourth quarter situation to snuff out a fake punt attempt. Robertson has been voted as a captain of the coverage units for the third consecutive season and has two stops.

In another addition to the club's special teams units, Gray led the team in 2019 with 17 stops, blocked a punt and recovered a fumble on a muffed punt as he was selected an *Associated Press* second-team All-Pro. Gray has two stops in 2020

Special teams played a key role in the team's season opening 34-23 win over Tampa Bay on September 13. Two players called up from the practice squad the day before made a significant impact, wide receiver **Bennie Fowler III** and defensive lineman **Margus Hunt**. Early in the fourth quarter with New Orleans leading 31-17, the Saints took advantage of a facemask penalty on New Orleans' prior touchdown to have it assessed on the kickoff. Fowler then recovered a muffed return on a short kickoff at the Tampa Bay 18-yard line to help set up a Lutz field goal. Late in the second quarter with New Orleans leading 14-7, the 6-9 Hunt blocked a 54-yard field goal attempt to eventually put Lutz in position to drill a 29-yard field goal. Morstead captured NFC Special Teams Player of the Week honors, punting six times for a 44.0 net punting average with five punts inside the 20.

Special teams also played a key role in the team's Oct. 12 30-27 overtime win over the Chargers. Lutz was a perfect three-of-three, booting field goals of 48, 53 and 36 yards. His shortest came in overtime to give New Orleans their first lead of the contest as he was named NFC Special Teams Player of the Week. Rookie wide receiver **Marquez Callaway** filled in for an injured Deonte Harris in the return game and brought back six punts for 69 yards and returned two kickoffs for 57 yards. In overtime, running back **Alvin Kamara's** 31-yard kickoff return gave New Orleans favorable starting field position at their 34-yard line for the game-winning drive.

Every facet of special teams made a difference in Sunday's 26-23 overtime win at Chicago. Lutz booted four-of-five field goals, including the 35-yard game winner in overtime. Chicago averaged only 15.3 yards per return on four kickoff returns, with two stopped at the 11- and 13-yard lines. Harris averaged 22.3 yards on three punt returns, including a season-long 42-yard runback. Hardee led the units with two stops.

RETURN UNITS

Wide receiver/return specialist **Deonte Harris** has made an impact on New Orleans' return game since being picked up an undrafted free agent in 2019. Harris was signed following the NFL Draft out of NCAA Division II Assumption, where he finished his college career as one of the most prolific returners in NCAA history. In the final game of his college career, he set the NCAA-All Division record for career combined return touchdowns (14).

In 2019, Harris brought back 36 punts for 338 yards (9.4 avg.), ranked first in the NFC and fourth in the National Football in punt return average, ranked second among

rookies, following a 53-yard runback for a touchdown in the first quarter of the Sept. 22 33-27 win at Seattle.

He also returned 24 kickoffs for 644 yards (26.8 avg.), second in the NFC and third in the NFL and has recorded one special teams stop. On offense Harris carried twice for 18 yards (9.0 avg.) and caught six passes for 24 yards.

Harris is the first player signed by New Orleans as an undrafted rookie following the draft to be selected to the Pro Bowl as a rookie.

DREW BREES

- Since first signing with New Orleans in 2006 and starting all 223 regular season games he has appeared in, a club record in both categories, Brees leads the NFL with 66,966 passing yards, 480 touchdown passes, 8,605 attempts, 5,896 completions, a 68.8 completion percentage, 115 games with at least 300 yards passing, 16 with at least 400, 509 completions of 25 yards or more and stands at third in the league with a 101.4 passer rating.
- Since signing with the Saints, Brees threw for 4,000 or more yards in his first 12 seasons with the club before sitting out the 2018 regular season finale at 3,992 and became the only National Football League signal-caller to throw for 5,000 yards five different times and ranked at or near the top in every passing category.
- In 11 regular season games sandwiched between a right thumb injury in 2019, Brees enjoyed another standout season as he completed 281-of-378 passes (74.3%) for 2,979 yards with 27 touchdowns, four interceptions and a career-high 116.3 passer rating. Brees finished ranked first in the NFL in completion percentage, second in passer rating and fourth in fourth quarter passer rating (110.2).
- Through the first seven contests of 2020, Brees has completed 185-of-253 passes (73.1%) for 1,898 yards, 13 touchdowns, three interceptions and a 106.5 passer rating, while also rushing for two touchdowns Brees leads the NFL in completion percentage.
- Brees has been selected to play in a team-record 12 Pro Bowls as a Saint, with 13 overall berths in the National Football League's all-star game, three times as a starter, including his most recent selection in 2019. His seven consecutive selections (2008-14) as a Saint is tied for first in club history with Pro Football Hall of Fame tackle William Roaf and Brees has been a Pro Bowl selection for the last four campaigns.
- Brees has posted a 138-84 regular season mark in games he has started since signing with the Saints in 2006. In Week 15 of the 2016 season, Brees earned his 100th regular season victory in a Saints uniform. Including his eight playoff victories, his 146 total wins as a member of the Saints make him the winningest quarterback in team history and the NFL's second-winningest signal-caller since 2006.
- In his 20-year National Football League playing career during which he has appeared in 282 regular season games with 281 starts, ranked fifth in league record books for signal-callers and tied for 19th overall, Brees has completed 7,052-of-10,414 passes (67.7%) for 79,314 yards, 560 touchdown passes and a 98.6 passer rating. He

stands as the NFL's all-time most accurate passer and is also the leader in attempts, completions, passing yards and is ranked second in touchdown passes.

BREES VS. BRADY

Sunday night's battle for first place in the NFC South vs. Tampa Bay will pose added significance as following the Buccaneers' offseason signing of QB Tom Brady, the matchup will feature the two most statistically prolific matchups in NFL record books. The season opener was the first matchup in NFL history of two quarterbacks aged 40 and older in Brees (41) and Brady (43). Brees is first and Brady second all-time in completions and passing yards, with Brady edging Brees by one in touchdowns.

Brees and Brady have faced off seven times against each other over the past 22 years in both college and pro, starting in the Big Ten Conference (Brees-Purdue, Brady-Michigan) in 1999. Below is a summary of their six NFL meetings with the seventh on deck Sunday.

Sept. 29, 2002 - Brees and the Chargers defeated the Brady-led Patriots, 21-14 at Qualcomm Stadium in his first season as a starter to help San Diego improve to 4-0. Brees completed 10-of-18 passes for 104 yards with a first quarter 52-yard touchdown to Curtis Conway.

Oct. 2, 2005 - Brees and the Chargers defeated the Brady-led Patriots, 41-17 at Gillette Stadium in Foxboro, Mass. Brees completed 19-of-24 passes (79.2%) for 248 yards, two touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 137.5 passer rating. Brees was named AFC Offensive Player of the Week as the Chargers ended the Patriots' NFL-record 21-game home winning streak.

Nov. 30, 2009 - In a 38-17 win over Brady and New England on Monday Night Football to improve New Orleans to 11-0, Brees was named NFC Offensive Player of the Week after posting the only perfect (158.3) passer rating of his career by completing 18-of-23 passes (78.3%) with five touchdowns.

Oct. 13, 2013 - With the Saints leading 27-23 with 2:24 remaining at Gillette Stadium, Brady led an eight-play, 70-yard game-winning drive that ended with a 17-yard TD pass from five seconds left to snap New Orleans' 5-0 start.

Sept. 17, 2017 - Brees and Brady combined for 803 yards passing, five touchdowns and zero interceptions as New England bested New Orleans in a 36-20 Superdome shootout.

Sept. 13, 2020 - Brees tossed two touchdowns, while Brady tossed two picks in a season-opening Saints win to spoil Brady's Buccaneers debut.

He ranked first on the club and sixth in the NFL in total yards from scrimmage (1,554), second on the team in rushing and receiving, carrying 120 times for 728 yards (6.1 avg.) with eight TDs and a two-point conversion, catching 81 passes for 826 yards (10.2 avg.) with five TDs and a kickoff return for a TD for a club rookie record 14 total scores, tied for second in the NFL. Kamara finished first in the NFL in yards per carry.

• Kamara was the first Saints offensive rookie selected to the Pro Bowl since Rueben Mayes (1986), as an *Associated Press* second team All-Pro (flex), the club's first rookie All-Pro since 1993. He was named *The Sporting News* NFL Rookie of the Year and *AP* NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year.

LATAVIUS MURRAY

- Originally a sixth round pick of the Raiders in the 2013 NFL Draft out of the University of Central Florida, the versatile back brings a bruising style to the Black and Gold to complement Kamara. Signed as an unrestricted free agent from the Minnesota Vikings in 2019, Murray has appeared in 100 career games with 59 starts for the Raiders, Vikings and Saints, carrying 1,116 times for 4,617 yards (4.1 avg.) with 41 touchdowns and catching 172 passes for 1,209 yards, including his first career receiving touchdown scored vs. Arizona on October 27, 2019.

- In his first season in New Orleans, Murray played in all 16 games for the third consecutive season with seven starts, carrying 146 times for 637 yards (4.4 avg.) with five touchdowns to tie for the team lead and also caught 34 passes for 235 yards with his first career receiving touchdown, to rank third on the club in overall scores. • Sanders joined the Saints in the 2020 offseason as an unrestricted free agent and is in his 11th NFL season. He has been a member of four teams since being selected in the third round (82nd overall) of the 2010 NFL Draft by the Pittsburgh Steelers, and has appeared in 149 games with 106 starts over that period. In his long career marked by big play ability, he has accumulated 8,197 receiving yards off 627 catches (13.1 avg.), recording 44 touchdowns.

• After spending the final four games of the 2018 campaign with the Denver Broncos on Injured Reserve with a ruptured Achilles tendon, Sanders went through an aggressive rehab and in a season split between the Broncos and San Francisco 49ers, appeared in 17 games with 16 starts and posted 66 receptions for 869 yards with five touchdowns, also tossing a 35-yard touchdown in San Francisco's matchup with New Orleans as his acquisition played an important role in the 49ers run to the Super Bowl.

• For the season, Sanders has posted 26 receptions for 304 yards with two scoring grabs as his connection with Drew Brees heats up with an increasing familiarity with the Saints offense and his teammates, this showing in the October 12 win over the Los Angeles Chargers, when he posted a career-high 12 grabs for 122 yards.

• A talented second-year wideout, who was selected by New Orleans in the third round of the 2018 draft out of UCF, the 6-1, 210-pounder emerged as one of the Knights' top weapons from 2015-17 and was a key figure in their emergence. During that period, he caught 168 passes for 2,748 yards (16.4 avg.) with 22 touchdowns. MARCUS DAVENPORT

• Trading up to the 14th spot in the 2018 NFL Draft, the Saints addressed the line and the pass rush with this gifted pass rusher, only the second draft choice ever from Texas-San Antonio. During four college seasons, Davenport notched totals of 186 tackles (97 solo), 22 sacks, 38 tackles for loss, six forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries, one returned for a touchdown and eight passes defended, finishing his career as the school's all-time leader for stops for loss, takedowns and quarterback hurries (21). In 13 games as a rookie, Davenport posted 22 tackles (12 solo), four sacks, two passes defended and one forced fumble. He served as a solid bookend opposite Jordan in 2019, starting all 12 games before being placed on Injured Reserve and posting 29 stops, six sacks and four forced fumbles. Davenport enjoyed a breakout performance on Thanksgiving night at Atlanta where he recorded two sacks to tie a career-high and added three forced fumbles.

• After recovering from toe and elbow injuries, Davenport made his debut in the team's win over the Chargers on Oct. 12, recording two quarterback hits and one pass defense. In Sunday's win vs. Carolina, his fourth quarter sack of Panthers QB Teddy Bridgewater forced them to attempt an unsuccessful 65-yard field goal attempt and help spur New Orleans to a win. He added half a sack in New Orleans overtime win at Chicago Sunday.

TREY HENDRICKSON

- Selected by the Saints in the third round of the 2017 NFL Draft, Hendrickson came to the Saints from Florida Atlantic, where he departed the school with a team-record 29.5 career sacks. Hendrickson has appeared in 28 career games in three seasons, recording 35 tackles (22 solo), six takedowns, two passes defended and two forced fumbles. Following an offseason, where he made significant strides in the weight room and with his technique, Hendrickson's hard work paid off with two sacks in the Sept. 9, 2019 season-opening win over Houston followed up by a takedown/forced fumble in Week Two at the Los Angeles Rams and one on Thanksgiving night at Atlanta. In his breakthrough campaign, he had 19 tackles, 4.5 sacks to rank fourth on the club and added one more takedown in a postseason contest.

- Hendrickson has started the first seven games of 2020, Hendrickson leads the team with 5.5 sacks to tie a career-high, tied for 12th in the NFL.

CARL GRANDERSON

- Signed by New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Wyoming, Granderson posted 17.5 career sacks in college and possesses the perfect body type for a pass rusher. As a rookie, Granderson appeared in eight regular season contests, posting ten tackles and one sack as he moved into the defensive line rotation in December and is expected to see more action in 2020.

- Granderson posted a quarterback takedown and a forced fumble as he joined Hendrickson in a rotation to replace the injured Davenport in the season opener vs. Tampa Bay, posting three total tackles in 2020 and has added five tackles, one forced fumble and one pass defended.

DEFENSIVE TACKLES**MALCOM BROWN**

- This former first round draft pick out of the University of Texas was a vital part of a Patriots defensive line that helped pick up two Super Bowl championships in the last three seasons. The University of Texas product has been a run-stopping force in the New England defensive line for the past four seasons and now with New Orleans after signing as an unrestricted free agent in the offseason, playing in 83 career games with 74 starts and recording career totals of 235 tackles (125 solo), ten sacks, one forced fumble and four fumble recoveries. Brown supplemented the middle a Saints defense that finished the 2019 regular sea-

son fourth in opponent rushing yards per game, posting 1.5 sacks and one fumble recovery in all 16 contests as well as 34 stops, adding one more split sack in the NFC Wild Card Playoff loss.

- Brown has opened all seven contests posting 15 tackles (four solo) in providing a line of defense for the NFL's third-ranked run defense.

DAVID ONYEMATA

- A fourth round selection out of Manitoba in 2016, Onyemata teams with Brown to form a solid duo in the interior of the Saints defensive line. In 64 games with 26 starts in four seasons, he has posted 141 career tackles, 9.5 sacks, two passes defended and one forced fumble. In 16 games with four starts in 2018, Onyemata posted 36 tackles, in helping with a run defense ranked second in the National Football League. On Nov. 29, 2018 vs. Dallas, he enjoyed a breakout performance with career-highs in tackles (seven), Quarterback takedowns (three) and forced fumbles (one). In 2019, he opened all 15 regular season games he played in, posting 32 stops, one pass defended and three sacks for the NFL's fourth-ranked run defense. Onyemata was re-signed to a three-year contract by the Saints in the offseason and is ranked second on the team with three quarterback takedowns, including one in Sunday's overtime win at Chicago.

SHELDON RANKINS

- The third defensive lineman selected in the 2016 NFL Draft out of Louisville, Sheldon Rankins started all 16 games in 2017 posting 26 tackles (16 solo), two sacks for loss of 13 yards, one interception, one pass defended and one forced fumble. He helped a defensive unit that went from 31st in the NFL, allowing 28.4 points per game in 2016 to allowing 20.4 points per game in 2017, good for tenth in the league. In 2018, Rankins had a career-high 40 tackles (26 solo), a forced fumble and a career-best eight sacks to rank second on the club and fifth in the National Football League among defensive tackles.

- In 2019, after ardent rehabilitation from a ruptured Achilles tendon, Rankins returned to the lineup in Week Four and contributed two sacks to the defensive line rotation, being voted by his teammates as the team's Ed Block Courage Award winner. The outlook is optimistic for Rankins in 2020 with his injuries further behind him, having recorded his first sack of the season in the Oct. 12 contest against the Chargers.

LINEBACKERS

DEMARIO DAVIS

- This dependable and sure-tackling defender joined the Saints after a breakout 2017, where he started 16 games for the New York Jets. Davis posted a team-high and career-high 165 tackles (112 solo) and a career-best five sacks. For his career, the Brandon, Miss. native has appeared in 134 games with 120 starts for the Jets (2012-15, 2017), Cleveland (2016) and Saints, recording 919 tackles (614 solo), 24.5 sacks, two interceptions, 34 passes defended, three forced fumbles, five fumble recoveries and 24 special team stops.

- In 2018, Davis opened all 16 contests and led the team with 110 stops (74 solo), five sacks to lead the linebackers, four passes defended, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. Davis' abilities to diagnose and tackle played a key role in New Orleans ranking second in the National Football League in opponent rushing yards per game and opponent rushing yards per play. Participating in the postseason for the first time, Davis led the defense with 22 stops (15 solo), an interception in the NFC Championship and a pass defense. In 2019, he posted 111 stops, ranked first on the club, four sacks, one interception and 11 passes defended to help spur the league's fourth-ranked run defense.

- After agreeing to a three-year contract extension on Sunday, the defensive team captain went out and posted six tackles and sacked Buccaneers signal-caller Tom Brady in the September 13 season-opening win vs. Tampa Bay and has filled up the stat sheet with 42 tackles (28 solo) to tie for the team lead, two sacks and one pass defended.

CRAIG ROBERTSON

- In just his first year with the Saints in 2016, Robertson quickly became one of the defense's most important members. Robertson joined the Saints looking to contribute on defense and special teams, yet his production outpaced

even the highest expectations, posting 201 tackles, three interceptions and three fumble recoveries in his first two seasons. In 2018 and 2019, while he continued to contribute on defense he has served the as captain of the club's coverage units on special teams. Robertson, who has 554 career defensive stops and 49 special teams tackles, provides depth at all three linebacker positions and outstanding leadership to the defense and special teams units.

ALEX ANZALONE

- One of three third round picks in 2017, Anzalone came to the Saints after a solid career at the University of Florida. In his rookie season, Anzalone started four games before suffering a season-ending shoulder injury and posted 16 tackles, a sack and a pass defended. In 16 games with seven starts in 2018, posted 59 tackles (34 solo), two sacks, one interception, two passes defended and three forced fumbles.

- After missing the last 15 regular season and postseason contests of 2019 with a shoulder injury, Anzalone has opened the first six contests of 2020 at middle linebacker, recording 30 tackles (15 solo).

SECONDARY

MARSHON LATTIMORE

- Selected by the Saints in the first round (11th overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft, Lattimore started all 13 games he appeared in. He totaled 53 tackles (44 solo), a forced fumble, one fumble recovery, five interceptions for 85 yards and 18 passes defended, as he became the youngest Saint (21 years old) ever selected to the Pro Bowl and was selected as the AP NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year.

- In 2018, Lattimore opened all 16 contests and posted a career-high 59 tackles (49 solo), two interceptions, 12 passes defended, a club-best four forced fumbles, tied for fourth in the NFL and three fumble recoveries, returned for 91 yards, leading the team in takeaways and tied for the NFL lead in defensive fumble recoveries, the highest total among defensive backs. Lattimore also added two picks in the NFC Divisional Playoff win over Philadelphia.

- A standout 2019 campaign by Lattimore resulted in him being voted to the Pro Bowl. Lattimore started all 14 games he played in and posted 57 stops, one interception and ranked first on the team with 14 passes defended.

OUT OF THE MARSH

Below are Marshon Lattimore's 2020 defensive highlights

- In the season-opening, September 13 34-23 win vs. Tampa Bay, Lattimore was assigned to wideout Mike Evans, who recorded only one two-yard touchdown reception late in the fourth quarter with New Orleans already 34-17.
- In New Orleans 30-27 overtime win over the Los Angeles Chargers on Monday night, October 12, Lattimore saved the game and brought home victory with a tackle of Chargers wideout Mike Williams on fourth down, one yard short of the first down marker.
- In New Orleans' 26-23 overtime win at Chicago, Lattimore recorded his first interception of 2020.

JANORIS JENKINS

- A nine-year NFL veteran who was originally a second round draft pick of the St. Louis Rams in 2012, Jenkins has shown a nose for the ball during his stints with the Rams (2012-15), New York Giants (2016-19) and since joining the Saints prior to Week 16 of the 2019 campaign. He has played in 120 games with 117 starts, posting 512 tackles two sacks, 24 interceptions, with eight returned for touchdowns, 113 passes defended, six forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries, one blocked field goal and one return of a blocked field goal for a touchdown.

END ZONE LEADER

Affectionately nicknamed "Jackrabbit", Jenkins picked off Buccaneers signal-caller Tom Brady and returned it 36 yards into the end zone in the club's 2020 season opening win over Tampa Bay and moved into a tie for eighth all-time in NFL records.

MARCUS WILLIAMS

- After being selected in the second round of the 2017 NFL Draft (42nd overall) out of the Utah, this ball-hawking safety has started all 50 games he has appeared in, recording 195 tackles (153 solo), one sack, 11 interceptions, one returned for a touchdown, 23 passes defended, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. With a pick in his second consecutive season opener, Williams' 11 picks since being drafted is tied for ninth in the NFL over that period, tied for fourth among safeties.

- Williams opened 2019 in impressive fashion, recording a key third quarter pick in the Monday night win over Houston and posting a pick at the end of the Sept. 29 win vs. Dallas. He finished with 53 tackles (38 solo), the four interceptions to tie his career-high, with one returned for a touchdown, tied for third in the NFL, a career-best 13 passes defended, a forced fumble and two coverage stops.

MALCOLM JENKINS

- Returning to New Orleans this offseason after six seasons in Philadelphia, Malcolm Jenkins is one of the NFL's most intelligent and instinctive defensive backs. One of only two safeties in Saints history to be selected as an *Associated Press* All-Pro, Jenkins has played in 174 career games with 166 starts and has career totals of 1,156 tackles (818 solo), 12 sacks, 17 interceptions, with six returned for touchdowns, 121 passes defended, 15 forced fumbles, nine fumble recoveries, one special teams fumble recovery, one blocked field goal and 44 special teams stops. He has also played in 12 postseason contests with 10 starts and has recorded 73 tackles (52) solo, two sacks and five passes defended.

- The three-time Pro Bowler started all 16 regular season games at safety for the sixth straight campaign in 2019 and finished with a team-high 118 tackles (82 solo), a career-high four forced fumbles, a career-high tying 2.5 tackles, 12 passes defended and one fumble recovery. He added ten stops and a sack in Philadelphia's playoff game for the NFC East champions. In his 2020 Saints return, Jenkins is tied for first on the team with 42 tackles (29 solo), one sack and a club-best six passes defended through the first seven contests of 2020, playing virtually every defensive snap, after being voted by his teammates as a team captain.

- Selected in the fourth round (109th overall) of the 2019 overall draft out of the University of Florida by New Orleans, Gardner-Johnson's hard-hitting and playmaking persona took root as a rookie in 2019, when he played in all 16 games with seven starts, posting 46 tackles (35 solo), one interception, eight passes defended, a forced fumble, a fumble recovery and three special teams stops. In 2020, he has established a niche as the club's starting nickel, playing in all seven games with four starts and posting 38 tackles to rank second on the club and two passes defended for the NFL's eighth-ranked defense.

Patrick Robinson

- New Orleans' first round selection (32nd overall) in the 2010 NFL Draft out of Florida State, Robinson made significant contributions to the Saints secondary his first five seasons with the club followed by stints with the Colts, Chargers and Eagles. Re-signed by New Orleans in 2018, Robinson has fought back from injuries to play all four games with one start this season, posting five tackles (four solo), one interception and two passes defended, picking off his first pass in his second Saints stint on October 4 at Detroit, when he filled in for an injured Janoris Jenkins and Marshon Lattimore.

- Overall, in his 11-season NFL career, Robinson has played in 118 games with 60 starts, posting 344 tackles (280 solo), two sacks, 15 interceptions with one brought back for a touchdown, 86 passes defended and three forced fumble.
