**THE MATCHUP**

Coming off a 21-18 victory over the Atlanta Falcons on Sunday to improve to 5-9, the New Orleans Saints will play on the road for two consecutive weeks, starting by facing the Cleveland Browns on December 24 at FirstEnergy Stadium. It will be the first time New Orleans has visited Cleveland in the regular season since 2014.

The two teams last faced off in 2018, in what was a 21-18 victory for the New Orleans, the exact score of Sunday's triumph in the Caesars Superdome. Cleveland leads the overall series 13-5, but three of the last four meetings have been decided by five points or less, reflecting hard-fought games where the outcomes were not decided until the final drive each time.

New Orleans goes into the contest at 5-9, with the Saints, Falcons and Carolina Panthers all logjammed behind the 6-8 Tampa Bay Buccaneers in a competitive NFC South.

New Orleans was led by an efficient and explosive performance through the air from **Andy Dalton** and **Taysom Hill**, who combined to complete 13-of-19 passes (68.4%) for 231 yards with three touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 149.3 passer rating. Dalton connected on a pair of TD passes to TE **Juwan Johnson** and Hill completed

a 68-yard scoring throw to rookie speedster **Rashid Shaheed**. Dalton has completed 211-of-316 passes (66.8%) for 2,403 yards with 17 touchdowns, only seven interceptions and a 98.1 passer rating, ranked seventh in the NFL.

The young receiving duo of Johnson and Shaheed enjoyed a standout afternoon. Johnson, posted four grabs for 67 yards and his team-leading seven scoring grabs on the season rank second at his position. Shaheed finished with three receptions for 95 yards with his 22.3 yards per catch average leading the NFL for players with a minimum of 15 grabs.

The New Orleans defense held the Falcons to only 89 net yards passing, the lowest total by a Saints opponent in 2022. New Orleans managed four sacks and eight passes defended, while in the fourth quarter, DB **Justin Evans** forced a fumble by Falcons WR **Drake London**, that was recovered by CB **Bradley Roby** with 2:06 remaining, allowing New Orleans to gain two first downs and hold onto the ball until there were nine seconds remaining in the contest.

**This Week In The NFC South:** The Carolina Panthers (5-9), host the Detroit Lions (7-7) at Bank of America on Sunday and the Atlanta Falcons (5-9), play at the Baltimore Ravens (9-5), while the Tampa Bay Buccaneers (6-8) play at the Arizona Cardinals (4-10) on Christmas night.

**LAST MEETING**

**New Orleans Saints 21, Cleveland Browns 18; September 16, 2018 @ Mercedes-Benz Superdome** – The New Orleans Saints earned their first win of the 2018 season with a 21-18 come-from-behind victory over the Cleveland Browns at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome.

After the two clubs traded field goals in the first quarter, Cleveland kicker **Zane Gonzalez** kicked a 39-yard field goal with 1:55 left in the second quarter to give the Browns a 6-3 lead going into halftime.

To open up the second half, the Cleveland defense forced a three-and-out. Browns quarterback **Tyrod Taylor** then led them on a 12-play, 79-yard drive that ended with a one-yard touchdown run by running back **Carlos Hyde** to take a 12-3 lead following a missed extra point attempt.

New Orleans' offensive struggles continued as a promising drive that had the Saints at third-and-one at the Cleveland 40-yard line was derailed when Brees was sacked by **Larry Ogunjobi** for a ten-yard loss to be forced to punt.

Cleveland advanced to the New Orleans 26-yard line on the subsequent drive that entered into the fourth quarter, but a 44-yard field goal attempt by Gonzalez went wide left. The Saints got the ball back at their 34-yard line and Brees engineered a nine-play, 66-yard drive that ended with a two-yard touchdown pass to wide receiver **Michael Thomas** that put the Saints within two. The two clubs then traded three-and-outs, but safety **Marcus Williams**

picked off Taylor at the Cleveland 40 and returned it 22 yards to the 18-yard line. Four plays later, Brees connected with Thomas for a five-yard touchdown with a successful two-point conversion rush by running back **Alvin Kamara** to give the Saints an 18-12 lead. The Browns answered when Taylor connected with wide receiver **Andrew Callaway** on a 47-yard touchdown, but Gonzalez's extra point attempt went wide left. Brees and the Saints got the ball back and he led them down the field to set up a game-winning **Wil Lutz** 44-yard field goal with 21 seconds left.

Sunday's contest against Seattle was Hill's first career game with 3+ touchdowns. Hill now has 21 career rushing touchdowns, seven career touchdown receptions and nine career touchdown passes. He joins Tomlinson as the only players since 2000 with at least 20 rushing touchdowns, five receiving touchdowns and five touchdown passes in their career. With his 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> career rushing touchdown, Hill joins Walter Payton as only the second player in the Super Bowl era with 20 rushing touchdowns (21), eight passing touchdowns (nine) and six receiving touchdowns (seven). ### BUCKING THE ODDS

The Saints have a long tradition of finding players as free agents signed after the draft that make an impact. Several currently on the 53-man roster play key roles.

WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed** came to New Orleans as one of the all-time best Division FCS returners and after spending the first five weeks on the practice squad, made a quick impact, Oct. 16 vs. Cincinnati with a 44-yard rushing touchdown. He followed that up with a 53-yard touchdown reception on Oct. 20 at Arizona to become the only Saint to score a touchdown in each of his first two offensive touches. In Sunday's win over Atlanta, he finished with three receptions for 95 yards, with a 68-yard touchdown grab from Taysom Hill, the longest play from scrimmage of the season for New Orleans and the fifth-longest receiving TD by a Saints rookie all-time. Overall, he has carried for a 44-yard touchdown, caught 15 passes for 334 yards (22.3 avg.) with two TDs, returned 16 punts for 175 yards (10.9 avg.) and returned 11 kickoffs for 246 yards (22.4 avg.).

WR **Marquez Callaway** led the team in 2021 in two of four major receiving categories with a club-best 46 receptions for a team-high 698 yards (15.2 avg., ranked tenth in the National Football League) and a club-best six touchdown grabs as the team's only offensive skill player to play in all 17 games. In 2022, Callaway has 16 grabs for 158 yards with one touchdown and has returned four punts for 25 yards.

DE **Carl Granderson** played in 15 games in 2021 with three starts and posted 24 tackles and three sacks. In 2022, he has posted 40 stops (18 solo) and three sacks, recovering the first fumble of his career on December 5 at Tampa Bay.

P **Blake Gillikin** enjoyed an October, 2021 where he was selected as NFC Special Teams Player of the Month. ### PRACTICE MAKES PERFECT

A spot on the practice squad is another avenue to eventually get onto the active roster and have the opportunity to contribute. Below is an overview of players on the club's roster with extensive practice squad experience.

RB **Dwayne Washington** participated on the Saints practice squad briefly in 2018 after spending most of the 2016 and 2017 seasons on Detroit's active roster. Through development, the tailback, in addition to his running skills, has developed into a core special teams player with 11 stops, to have a career-high seven for 2021.

TE **Juwan Johnson** was signed by New Orleans out of Oregon, where he spent his graduate transfer season following the 2020 NFL Draft as a wideout. Recording four receptions for 39 yards seven contests, Johnson spent the majority of the season on the practice squad. Converted to tight end in 2021 and leading the position group with four touchdowns, Johnson's took advantage of his frame and participation in his first full offseason strength and conditioning program in 2022 and leads the tight ends group with 35 receptions for 416 yards with a club-best seven touchdown grabs, second in the league at his position.

After spending the last six weeks of the 2019 season and the first 16 weeks of the 2020 campaign on the practice squad, LB **Andrew Dowell** was elevated to the club's active roster for the regular season finale at Carolina. In two pre-season games in 2021, he posted five tackles, one forced fumble and two coverage spots to secure a regular season roster spot. In Week 3 at New England, Dowell recorded the first blocked punt that an opponent had against the Patriots since the 2015 season. Dowell's five special teams tackles on Dec. 19 at Tampa Bay was the highest single-game total in the NFL in 2021 and he finished the season tied for fifth in the league with 14 coverage stops. On Oct. 16 vs. Cincinnati, he forced a fumble on punt coverage and he posted a tackle at Arizona on October 20.

After splitting his rookie season in 2018 between the practice squad and active roster, DB **J.T. Gray** enjoyed a breakthrough campaign in 2019, when he was selected *AP* second-team All-Pro when he recorded 16 special teams tackles, one blocked punt and one coverage fumble recovery. In 2021, he was selected as a first-team All-Pro and to his first career Pro Bowl (starter), when he led the NFL with 19 special teams tackles (league-leading 16 solo). Gray leads the team with ten special teams stops in 2022, despite missing three games with a hamstring injury.

WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed** came to New Orleans as one of the all-time best Division I-AA returners and after spending the first five weeks on the practice squad, made a quick impact on Oct. 16 vs. Cincinnati with a 44-yard rushing TD. With his 53-yard receiving touchdown on October 20 at Arizona, Shaheed become the only Saint to score touchdowns on each of his first two career offensive touches. Shaheed has also handled return duties for New Orleans since being activated, bringing back 16 punts for 175 yards (10.9 avg.).

Originally signing as an undrafted free agent with Kansas City in 2014 out of BYU, S **Daniel Sorensen** spent the first half of his rookie season on the Chiefs practice squad before being elevated to the active roster at midseason where he contributed with seven tackles. Sorensen has played in 120 games with 41 starts, posting 379 tackles, 4.5 sacks, 12 interceptions, four returned for touchdowns, 33 passes defended, four forced fumbles, three fumble recoveries, 35 coverage stops, one special teams fumble recovery and one blocked field goal. Sorensen has one defensive tackle and six special teams stops in 2022

FB **Adam Prentice** was originally signed by Denver following the 2021 NFL Draft out of South Carolina. Joining the Saints at the conclusion of the 2021 preseason, Prentice appeared in seven games with three starts for New Orleans, carrying three times for five yards and catching three passes for 16 yards, while making one special teams stop. In 2022, he has played in seven games with one start, rushing two yards for a first down, catching two passes for five yards and also contributing on special teams with one tackle.

Originally selected as a third round pick by the Arizona Cardinals in 2015 out of Northern Iowa, RB **David Johnson** has been signed to the active roster after having stints on the Saints practice squad in 2022. In 88 career games with 63 starts for the Cardinals (2015-19), Houston Texans (2020-21) and Saints (2022), Johnson has carried 1,000 times for 4,055 yards (4.1 avg.) with 39 touchdowns and has caught 274 passes for 2,769 yards with 18 touchdowns.

### EVANS FIRST-YEAR SEMIFINALIST FOR PRO FOOTBALL HALL

Former New Orleans Saints right guard Jahri Evans is one of five first-year eligible nominees among 28 Modern-Era Player Semifinalists for the Pro Football Hall of Fame's Class of 2023. Originally selected by New Orleans in the fourth round of the 2006 NFL Draft out of Division II Bloomsburg, Evans arrived in New Orleans and captured right guard duties in training camp. For his Black and Gold career, Evans started all 169 regular season games and ten postseason contests that he appeared in at right guard, finishing his career opening 14 contests at Green Bay in 2017. He was a five-time *Associated Press* All-Pro selection and was selected to six consecutive Pro Bowls from 2009-14. A 2010's selection to the All-Decade team, Evans' four first-team All-Pro selections are double that of any other player in Saints history.

Ahead is a synopsis of several returning players and new-

comers through the draft and free agency to the 2022 Saints offensive line:

**T/G James Hurst** - An eight-year NFL veteran who was signed as a free agent from Baltimore in 2020, Hurst has 132 career regular season appearances with 77 starts at three different positions on the inside and outside. His versatility came in handy in 2020, as he started two contests at left tackle and one at left guard and the Saints gained over 200 yards rushing each time. In 2021, Hurst moved into the lineup for eight games at left tackle in place of an injured Armstead, two at left guard in place of an injured Andrus Peat and three at right tackle for an injured Ryan Ramczyk, starting contests at three different positions. Hurst has started 13 games at left tackle.

**RT Ryan Ramczyk** - The Black and Gold used their second first round selection in the 2017 NFL Draft to snag Ramczyk out of Wisconsin, one of the best linemen in the entire draft. After opening all 16 games and both post-season contests in 2017 and being selected as a PFWA All-Rookie, he has been selected as an AP All-Pro selection three times since. After missing seven contests in 2021, Ramczyk has rebounded to open every game in 2022, also having been elected as a team captain.

**G/C Cesar Ruiz** - The hard-working, talented and intelligent lineman is a perfect fit for New Orleans' culture with the 24th pick in the 2020 NFL Draft out of the University of Michigan. The three-year letterman played in 36 games in college, starting his last 31 including the final 26 at center, earning All-Big Ten in 2019. Ruiz settled in at right guard in the last 15 games, with nine starts, as well as both post-season contests. When McCoy suffered a lower leg injury in the first quarter of the 2021 season-opening win over Green Bay, Ruiz transitioned over to his natural position, where the Saints did not give up a sack and started four contests in the middle. He returned to right guard on Oct. 25 at Seattle and was the only lineman in 2021 to not miss a start. Ruiz has opened 13 games at right guard and one at center in 2022. The 46 consecutive starts for Ruiz is the longest current streak for a Saint.

**T/G Andrus Peat** - A first round selection (13th overall) in the 2015 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Peat was considered one of the top college linemen in 2014. In his first eight seasons, he's played in 90 regular season games with 85 starts, opening a contest at every position except center. In 2020, he opened 13 contests at left guard as he was part of the NFC Pro squad for the third consecutive season. In 2021, he opened the first six contests, where New Orleans got off to a 4-2 start before suffering a season-ending pectoral injury. In his return to the starting lineup in the 2022 season opener in Atlanta, New Orleans rushed for 151 yards. In back-to-back weeks, Peat was been a part rushing efforts of 200-yards plus by the club for the first time since 2020. **CONTINUED ON NEXT PAGE**

**Center/Guard Erik McCoy** - New Orleans traded up in the second round of the 2019 NFL Draft to select this standout from Texas A&M, who was a three-year starter, anchoring the middle of the Aggies line. In 2018, he was a team captain who paved the way for the SEC's leading rusher and in 2019 was the first Saint in franchise history to start at center in Week One, opening all 16 regular season contests. McCoy opened all 16 contests and both postseason games in 2020 for the NFL's sixth-ranked rushing offense. McCoy started 13 contests at center in 2021. Prior to the Week One season opener at Atlanta, McCoy agreed to a five-year contract extension with the Saints.

**Tackle Landon Young** - A mainstay at left tackle for his entire college career at the Kentucky, Young played in 49 contests with 30 starts in his college career. The Lexington, Ky. native was selected by New Orleans in the sixth round of the 2021 NFL Draft and held up to the competition in training camp to snare a roster spot. Young opened one contest at right tackle in 2021 and serves as Ramczyk's backup on the right side, also playing jumbo tight end. On October 13 at Pittsburgh, he slide over to left tackle for the second half to replace Hurst (concussion) and opened this the November 20 win over the Rams at one of the league's most challenging positions.

**Offensive Lineman Calvin Throckmorton** - This 6-5, 309 pound former four-year starter on the Oregon line was signed as an undrafted free agent in 2020, possessing the flexibility to play all five positions along the offensive line. After spending his rookie season on the practice squad, Throckmorton increased strength in the 2021 offseason and made strides in training camp. In his NFL debut in the 2021 season opening-win, Throckmorton was called to play right guard following a lower leg injury to McCoy in the first quarter, subsequently starting four contests. He then moved into left guard, Oct. 25 at Seattle following a shoulder injury to Andrus Peat and opened the last ten, opening three in 2022 in place of an injured Peat and starting the Week 13 at right guard.

**Offensive Lineman Lewis Kidd** - This 6-5, 311 pounder closed out his college career with 48 consecutive starts at Montana State, third in school history. Possessing the versatility to play both guard and tackle, he was selected a consensus first-team All-American in the fall of 2021. Kidd was the only Saints undrafted free agent rookie to secure a roster spot in Week One of the regular season and made his first career NFL start, opening at left guard on November 13 at Pittsburgh.

## DEFENSIVE NOTES

### DEFENSIVE DRAFTS

Over the last eight drafts from 2015-22, the New Orleans Saints have shown a commitment to building up the team's defense, spending 21-of-33 picks on that side of the ball. With nine picks in 2015, the Saints picked six defensive players, the most taken since New Orleans chose nine in a 12-round selection meeting in 1990. Below is an overview of the defensive players on the 53-man roster selected from 2015-22 with the club:

**CB Paulson Adebo, Stanford (D3-21)** - Selected in the third round (76th overall) of the 2021 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Adebo finished his college career playing in 22 games with 21 starts and recording 97 tackles, 34 passes defended and eight interceptions, earning All-Pac-12 in 2018 and 2019. He started in the opener and became the first Saint to record an interception in his National Football League debut since 2002. With three picks, he became only the fifth Saints rookie to reach that level. Overall, he posted 63 tackles (54 solo), three picks and eight passes defended. After missing the first two contests of 2022 with an ankle injury, Adebo has posted 51 tackles (40 solo) and six passes defended.

**DE Marcus Davenport, Texas-San Antonio (D1-18)** - Davenport joined the Saints with the 14th overall pick in the 2018 NFL Draft after showing potential and production as a pass rusher at Texas-San Antonio. In four seasons, Davenport posted 22 sacks, including 8.5 in 2017 when he captured Conference USA Defensive Player of the Year. Davenport's strength on the line is a valuable asset for the Saints front, as he finished second on the team with a career-high nine sacks and added a club-best three forced fumbles and a fumble recovery in 11 games with nine starts in 2021, despite missing six games. In 12 contests with nine starts in 2022, Davenport has posted 26 stops and a split sack.

**LB Kaden Elliss, Idaho (D7-19)** - New Orleans selected this four-year starter from Idaho to compete at both linebacker and contribute on special teams. The Salt Lake City native finished his college career with 288 stops 47 tackles for loss and 17 sacks. After missing the bulk of his rookie year with a knee injury, Elliss showed promise with five stops on coverage units in 2020 and in 2021, his progress continued with 13 stops, one sack, one fumble recovery and one special teams tackle. In 2022, Elliss has posted a career-high 59 defensive tackles (33 solo), a career-best 5.5 sacks, tied for second on the team, two passes defended, one forced fumble and four special teams stops. Elliss led the team with 35 stops in the month of November and has followed that up with 12 stops in the two December contests.

**CB Marshon Lattimore, Ohio State (D1a-17)** - The 11th overall selection in the 2017 NFL draft out of Ohio State possesses all the traits of a lockdown defender. With his agile, fluid style, Lattimore has the ability to shut down the best wide receivers. In 2017, he finished with 53 stops, five picks, to lead NFL rookies and the Saints, tying a team rookie record, a club-best 18 passes defended, a forced fumble and a recovery. Lattimore was the first Saints corner selected to the Pro Bowl since 1995 and selected as *AP* Defensive Rookie of the Year. In 2021, he reached the Pro Bowl for the fourth time, finishing with 68 tackles, three picks, a career-high and league-best 19 passes defended and a fumble recovery to lead the team with four takeaways. The Saints will welcome the return to action of Lattimore soon, as he recovers from an abdomen injury.

**DT David Onyemata, Manitoba (D4-16)** - Possessing a unique combination of size and speed, this Nigeria native had an impressive rookie year after becoming the first player from the University of Manitoba to be drafted into the NFL. Despite being new to football, the 2016 fourth round draft pick has become a critical member on the interior of the Saints defensive front in 2017, playing in 103 regular season contests with 65 starts, posting 248 career stops, 21.5 sacks for a loss of 144 yards, one interception, six passes defended, one forced fumble and two fumble recoveries. In 2021, Onyemata started all 11 games he played in and posted 34 tackles, two sacks for a loss of 17 yards and one fumble recovery. For the first time in his career, Onyemata has recorded sacks in three consecutive contests in 2022 in three straight weeks, as he has anchored the middle of the defensive line with 32 tackles (19 solo), 3.5 quarterback takedowns, a pass defense and a fumble recovery

**CB Alontae Taylor, Tennessee (D2-22)** - A four-year starter at the University of Tennessee, this 6-foot, 193-pound defender possesses a combination of speed, instincts and versatility needed to excel on defense and special teams. After playing quarterback in high school and starting his college career at wide receiver, he took to the secondary quickly, finishing with totals of 162 tackles, a split sack, five stops for loss, three forced fumbles, one fumble recovery for a touchdown, four interceptions, one returned 56 yards for a touchdown, 17 passes defended and a blocked punt. Taylor's played an extensive role on defense the last seven contests and his ten passes defended lead the team to go with 38 tackles (33 solo).

**DE Payton Turner, Houston (D1-21)** - Selected 28th overall in the 2021 NFL Draft, the Texas native comes off a senior campaign where he posted 10.5 tackles for loss and five sacks in only five contests. During four college seasons, Turner notched totals of 115 tackles, ten sacks, 25

tackles for loss, one interception, a forced fumble, ten passes defended and a blocked punt. After having his rookie campaign cut short by a shoulder injury, Turner came back strong in the 2022 season opener at Atlanta with his blocked field goal on the last play of the game securing a dramatic come-from behind 27-26 victory for New Orleans. Oct. 30 vs. Las Vegas, he had his first multiple sack game.

**LB Pete Werner, Ohio State (D2-21)** - New Orleans selected this three-year starter from Ohio State to compete at linebacker. The Indianapolis native finished his college career playing in 47 games with 35 starts, recording 185 tackles, 16 stops for loss, four sacks, 11 passes defended, four forced fumbles and two recoveries. Werner helped power the Buckeyes to the College Football Playoff championship game as a senior in 2020, when he was voted by Big Ten coaches as a first-team All-Conference selection and a Butkus Award semifinalist, posting 54 tackles, 2.5 stops for loss, one sack and two forced fumbles. After a rookie campaign with 59 tackles, in 2022, Werner, currently is second on the team with 77 stops (54 solo), a team-leading two forced fumbles, two passes defended and a coverage tackle despite missing four contests with an ankle injury.

**DB P.J. Williams, Florida State (D3b-15)** - Williams' career was initially limited by missing all but two games his first two seasons, but he's become an integral member of the secondary. An experienced starter from Florida State, who developed into one of the nation's top cover corners, Williams has developed the ability to play any position in the secondary. He finished tied for the team lead with three picks in 2021 and added 42 tackles (36 solo), two sacks, four passes defended and one forced fumble, playing in 16 games with four starts. In 2022, Williams has played multiple positions and has 19 stops and two passes defended.

The Saints have stopped the run week to week impressively since 2017. In seven straight games in 2018, they didn't surrender 100 rushing yards to an opponent for the first

time since 2007 and had a seven-game run in 2020. In 2021, the Saints didn't give up 100 yards rushing in their last four contests. Below are the longest streaks in team history the defense has gone without surrendering 100 yards. Between 2017-20 they didn't allow a 100-yard rusher in a 55 straight games (regular season/postseason), the longest streak in NFL history. After the last streak ended, New Orleans again had the longest current NFL streak of not surrendering a 100-yard rusher until the 2022 season opener when 120 rushing yards were given up to Atlanta RB Cordarelle Patterson. New Orleans gave up a season-low 38 yards rushing in the Oct. 30th 24-0 shutout of Las Vegas, the lowest total surrendered since giving up only 34 in Week 9 vs. Atlanta in 2021. The 38 yards were tied for the 24th-lowest single-game total in club history and marked the ninth time that the Saints defense has given up fewer than 40 yards rushing since Allen assumed control of the New Orleans defense in the middle of the 2015 season.

### COVERAGE UNITS

New Orleans' coverage and block units in 2022 are led by LBs **Chase Hansen**, **Andrew Dowell**, DB **J.T. Gray**, safety **Daniel Sorensen** and RB **Dwayne Washington**.

A converted quarterback from college who ended up playing both safety and linebacker at Utah, Hansen was originally signed by New Orleans as a free agent in 2019 NFL Draft. After splitting the bulk of 2021 between the practice squad and the active roster where he recorded one special teams tackle in three games, Hansen's found a home in coverage and has recorded a career-high five special teams stops in nine contests in 2022..

After spending the bulk of 2019 and 2020 on the Saints practice squad, Dowell recorded his first career blocked punt on Sept. 26, 2021 at New England. He ranked second on the team with 14 stops and was tied for fifth in the NFL after having a career-high five tackles (four solo) Dec. 19 at Tampa Bay, the highest single-game total in the NFL in 2021. Oct. 16 vs. Cincinnati, Dowell posted a tackle and a forced fumble, recovered to set up a touchdown.

Sorensen's a ninth-year NFL veteran who signed with New Orleans as an unrestricted free agent from Kansas City, where he spent his first eight NFL seasons, posting 29 coverage stops, one special teams fumble recovery and one blocked field goal to go with 378 defensive tackles, 4.5 sacks, 12 interceptions, 33 passes defended, four forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries. Sorensen has six coverage tackles in 2022 for New Orleans.

Signed by the Saints after the 2018 NFL Draft out of Mississippi State, Gray enjoyed a banner campaign in 2021. Voted by teammates as the club's special teams captain for the first time, Gray led the NFL with 19 tackles in 16 games, as he was selected as a Pro Bowl starter and as the team's only first-team AP All-Pro. Playing in 62 career games, Gray has career totals of 54 special teams stops, one blocked punt, three fumble recoveries and eight defensive tackles, 1.5 sacks and one pass defended, first on the team with ten coverage stops in 2022.

Washington, originally a seventh round draft pick of the Detroit Lions in 2016, since being promoted to the Saints active roster from the practice squad at the start of the 2018 season, the former University of Washington stand-out has become a core special teamer for New Orleans. Washington has recorded 15 stops, deflected a punt and recovered a blocked punt, posting a career-best seven stops in 2021. Pressed into tailback duty as well, Washington has 11 carries for 38 yards and one seven-yard reception in 2022.

### WIL LUTZ

Kicker **Wil Lutz** went undrafted in 2016, joining the Ravens for training camp. Prior to the start of the regular season, Lutz joined the Black and Gold. Lutz has kicked in 93 games, converting 162-of-190 field goal attempts (85.3 percent) and 281-of-288 PATs (97.6 percent). He's recorded 359 touchbacks, the fifth-most in the NFL since 2016 despite missing the 2021 campaign with an abdominal injury. His 85.3 percent field goal percentage is best among kickers in team history. Until the 2018 regular season finale, he'd kicked a field goal in a club-record 36 consecutive games, second-longest streak in NFL history. In scoring three points on December 6, 2020 at Atlanta to reach 101, Lutz joined Pro Football Hall of Famer Morten Andersen

(1985-89) as only the second Saint to score at least 100 points in five consecutive seasons, Lutz doing it in the first five years of his career. Lutz returned to the field with an immediate impact in the season-opening win at Atlanta on Sept. 11, drilling a 51-yard game winning field goal through the uprights with 19 seconds remaining to help secure a 27-26 victory for the Saints. In the past nine contests, Lutz has drilled 60– and 56-yard kicks, while making 16-of-19 field goals overall.

## QUARTERBACKS

### ANDY DALTON

• Dalton brings significant starting experience to the New Orleans Saints quarterback room. Originally a second round draft pick in the 2015 NFL Draft by the Cincinnati Bengals out of TCU, Dalton has played in 163 career games with 159 starts for Cincinnati (2011-19), Dallas (2020), Chicago (2021) and New Orleans this season and has completed 3,333-of-5,334 passes (62.5 pct.) for 37,682 yards, 243 touchdowns, 142 interceptions and an 87.7 passer rating. Dalton also has 464 career carries for 1,466 yards with 22 touchdowns.

• In 11 starts, Dalton has completed 211-of-316 passes (career-high 66.8%) for 2,403 yards with 17 touchdowns, seven interceptions and a 98.1 passer rating. Dalton is ranked in the top ten in completion percentage and passer rating.

## SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

• Dalton received the starting nod in place of an injured Winston on October 2 against Minnesota in London and completed 20-of-28 passes (71.4%) for 236 yards with one touchdown, zero interceptions and a 108.6 passer rating.

• Dalton helped snap a three-game losing streak for New Orleans on Oct. 9 against Seattle, as he completed 16-of-24 passes for 187 yards with one touchdown, as he helped engineer a fourth quarter 39-32 come-from-behind win.

• Dalton rebounded from three second quarter interceptions to complete 30-of-47 passes (63.8%) for 361 yards with four touchdowns vs. Arizona on Oct. 20. It was the highest single-game passing yardage total by a Saints quarterback since Drew Brees passed for 373 yards against the Cardinals in the Superdome on Oct. 27, 2019.

• Dalton was a model of efficiency in a 24-0 shutout victory over Las Vegas on Oct. 30, when he completed 22-of-30 passes for 229 yards with two touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 117.2 passer rating.

### JAMEIS WINSTON

• The 2013 Heisman Trophy winner at Florida State and the first pick in the 2015 NFL Draft, Winston has appeared in 86 games with 80 starts, completing 1,738-of-2,835 passes (61.3%) for 21,840 yards with 139 touchdowns, 96 interceptions and an 87.7 rating, adding 1,220 rushing yards and 11 touchdowns. In 2021, before suffering a season-ending knee injury in Week Eight, Winston completed 95-of-161 passes for 1,170 yards, 14 touchdowns, three interceptions and a 102.8 passer rating, ranked first in the NFL at the time of his injury in touchdown percentage (8.7).

• In three contests in 2022, Winston has completed 73-of-115 passes for 858 yards with four touchdowns, five interceptions and a 79.5 passer rating.

## POWERFUL STARTS

• Winston improved his record in season-opening starts to 4-2 and became only the third Saints quarterback to win his first two season-opening starts as a member of the Black and Gold. Winston completed 21-of-30 passes for 269 yards and two touchdowns for 213 yards, two touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 111.0 passer rating in the 27-26 win over Atlanta on Sept. 11.

• In the 2021 season opener vs. Green Bay played in Jacksonville, Fla., Winston had one of the most impressive first starts in a Black and Gold uniform amongst its signal-callers. He passed for 148 yards on 14-of-20 passing (70.0%) with a 130.8 rating. Winston threw five touchdown passes. His five touchdown passes tied a career-high. He also finished with 37 rushing yards on six attempts. In his first start with the Saints, Winston became the third player since 1950 to throw for five touchdowns in his first start with a team. Winston's 148 passing yards is the fewest yards with five passing touchdowns since 1948. With zero interceptions, Winston became the first quarterback in NFL history to throw five touchdown passes with no interceptions in his first career start with a new team in an opener. Overall, Winston became the seventh quarterback with five touchdowns and no interceptions in an opener, and first since Baltimore's Lamar Jackson did so at Miami on Sept. 8, 2019. Winston became the 33rd player to start a game at quarterback for New Orleans, and the 11th to win in his first start. It was Winston's first career win over Green Bay.

## COMEBACK KID

• In the September 11 come-from-behind victory over Atlanta, Winston engineered the Saints from a 16-point fourth quarter deficit for the first time in franchise history. In leading two touchdown drives and the game-winning field goal drive, he completed 13-of-16 passes (81.3 percent) for 213 yards with two touchdowns and a perfect 158.3 passer rating in the final period of the contest. It was the 13th fourth quarter/overtime comeback of Winston's career. New Orleans came from 16 points behind in the fourth quarter for the victory for the first time in franchise history, the 209th time, they were 16 points or more behind in a fourth quarter.

## SECOND THROUGH FIVE

In his first five National Football League seasons, Jameis Winston threw for 19,737 yards, the second-most yards ever by a player from their rookie season through their fifth season.

He ranked first on the club and sixth in the NFL in yards from scrimmage (1,554), second on the team in rushing and receiving, carrying 120 times for 728 yards (6.1 avg.) with eight TDs and a two-point conversion, catching 81 passes for 826 yards (10.2 avg.) with five TDs and a kickoff return for a TD for a club rookie record 14 total scores, tied for second in the NFL. Kamara finished first in the NFL in yards per carry.

• Kamara was the first Saints offensive rookie selected to the Pro Bowl since Rueben Mayes (1986), as an AP second team All-Pro (flex), the clubs' first rookie All-Pro since

1993. He was named *The Sporting News* NFL Rookie of the Year and AP NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year.

## TOUCHDOWN LEADER

In the Saints' 2020 Christmas Day 52-33 win over the Vikings, Kamara tied the NFL record for total touchdowns and rushing touchdowns, as he carried 22 times for a career-high 155 yards (7.0 avg.), adding three receptions for 17 yards for 172 yards from scrimmage. ## VERSATILE THREAT

In 2020, Kamara carried 187 times for a club-best and career-high 932 yards (5.0 avg.) with a franchise-record 16 TDs, becoming the second Saint to reach double-digits in rushing scores in two seasons. He caught a team-high 83 passes for a club-best 756 yards and five TDs, leading the team in rushing, receiving and receiving yardage.

## WIDE RECEIVERS

### JARVIS LANDRY

• Signed by New Orleans as a free agent after the 2022 NFL Draft, this former Litcher High and LSU standout returns home as one of the league's most accomplished receivers has quickly established chemistry with the Saints offense to become one of its top targets. Posting career totals in 131 career games with 116 starts with Miami (2014-17), Cleveland (2018-21) and the Saints (2022), the five-time Pro Bowler has produced 713 catches for 7,870 yards with 38 touchdowns. He ranks fifth in the NFL in receptions since coming into the league as a second round pick of the Dolphins in 2014. Landry is just one of five players to have 700-plus catches since 2014. Since being drafted in 2014, Landry is ranked fifth in the league in receptions (713), ninth in first down receptions (406) and 12th in receiving yards (7,870).

## HOMECOMING

Landry made an immediate impact in the uniform of his home state team on September 11 at Atlanta, grabbing a team-leading seven passes for a team-high 114 yards (club-best 16.3 yards per reception), with four of his catches going for first downs. Landry was particularly clutch on New Orleans' drive for the game-winning field goal late in the fourth quarter, when he made a difficult catch for a 40-yard gain, the longest reception of the game for the Saints. Playing in all four games, Landry has fought through an ankle injury that has sidelined him for the five games and returned to the lineup on November 13 at Pittsburgh with three grabs for 37 yards then posted three grabs for 33 yards with his first touchdown as a Saint in the November 20 win over the Los Angeles Rams. He will look to build on his 25 receptions for 272 yards with the scoring grab over the final three games of the season in helping New Orleans make a push up the NFC South division race.

## TWO AT A TIME

Since Week 2 of his rookie season in 2014 until Week 2 of the 2021 campaign, Landry caught at least two passes in 111 consecutive games. His streak was the best in the NFL since 2014 and was the fourth-longest all-time.

### CHRIS OLAVE

• A talented wide receiver who became one of the most prolific receivers in Buckeyes history, Olave played in 47 games and caught 176 passes for 2,711 yards (15.4 avg.) with 35 touchdowns. Olave's 35 career touchdown receptions set an Ohio State program record and ranks fourth in Big Ten history. His 11 career 100-yard games also ranks second in school history. Olave entered the starting lineup in 2019 with immediate results. He helped lead the Buckeyes to three consecutive Big Ten championships (2018-2020) and back-to-back College Football Playoff appearances (2019, 2020). In the 2020 CFP Semifinal vs. Clemson, Olave had a career night, hauling in six passes for 132 yards and two touchdowns in a 49-28 win, securing a bid to play in the championship game. Olave will look to integrate into the Saints offense in training camp after a standout senior campaign, where he caught 65 passes for 936 yards (14.4 avg.) and 13 touchdowns, tied for sixth nationally, as he was selected as an AFCA first-team All-American and a consensus second-team All-American.

• Following a September, where he captured NFL Offensive Rookie of the Month honors with 17 grabs for a league rookie-best 268 yards, followed by scoring receiving touchdowns in back to back contests, Olave leads the team in receiving, yards per catch and receiving yardage with 63 grabs for 940 yards (14.9 avg.) with three touchdowns along with a successful two-point conversion. He leads all NFL rookies in third down receptions (24), tied for fourth in the league and is ranked second among rookies in receptions and receiving yardage.

## 1,000 CLUB

With a club-best 940 receiving yards in 2022, Olave needs 60 yards on Saturday at Cleveland to join wide receivers Michael Thomas (1,137-2016) and Marques Colston (1,038-2006) as only the third Saint with 1,000 yards receiving yards in his rookie season.

## TIGHT ENDS

### ADAM TRAUTMAN

- The Saints were pleased to find the 6-5, 253-pound Trautman available near the end of the third round of the 2020 NFL Draft and made an aggressive trade up to the 105th pick to add him out of Dayton. A converted high school quarterback, the Michigan native moved to tight end as a freshman developed into one of the top offensive player in NCAA FCS football, where he played in 44 games, recording 178 receptions for 2,295 yards (12.9 avg.) and 31 touchdowns. Though 16 contests in 2020, Trautman posted 15 receptions for 171 yards with one touchdown while also impressively developing his blocking ability.

- In 2021, Trautman continued progress in both blocking and pass-catching, leading the tight end unit with 27 grabs for 263 yards and two touchdowns. In 2022, despite being sidelined by an ankle injury for two contests, he has recorded 16 grabs for 173 yards and one touchdown, while adding a fumble recovery on special teams.

## TRIPLE TROUBLE

The New Orleans tight end trio of Trautman, Taysom Hill and Johnson have combined for 15 total touchdowns, with Hill (five rushing and two receiving) and Johnson (seven receiving), tied for the team lead. The 15 total touchdowns produced by the position group are the second-most for a tight ends group in the NFL in 2022. In Saints club record books, the production of 15 touchdowns among the group is ranked second in club record books.

### TAYSOM HILL

- Hill's brought unheralded versatility to the Saints offense and special teams. A constant participant on special teams from midseason in 2017 to midseason in 2020, as well as the backup signal-caller and as a runner and receiver, in 2018, Hill averaged 24.9 yards per return on 14 kickoff returns, had six coverage stops, second on the team, completed a ten-yard pass on a fake punt and blocked a punt. Overall, Hill carried 37 times for 196 yards (5.3 avg.), third on the team, with two touchdowns and completed three of seven passes for 64 yards. The blocked punt that sparked a division-clinching win at Tampa Bay, earning him Week 14 NFC Special Teams Player of the Week honors. In the postseason, he caught a touchdown, made a special teams tackle and executed a successful fake punt, making significant contributions in all facets as the team advanced to the NFC Championship game for the third time in franchise history.



- In 2019, Hill carried 27 times for 156 yards (5.8 avg.) with a touchdown, catching 19 passes for 234 yards with six TDs, deflecting a punt and posting two coverage stops. He ranked third on the club in touchdowns and third in receiving TDs. After a multi-threat performance Thanksgiving night at Atlanta, when he deflected a punt and caught and rushed for a touchdown. Hill became the first quarterback to rush for and catch a touchdown in the same contest since Jim McMahon (1983). In a valiant postseason effort vs. Minnesota, Hill led the team in rushing with four carries for 50 yards, caught two passes for 25 yards with a TD and completed a 50-yard pass.

- In 2020, Hill contributed on multiple facets, completing 88-of-121 passes (72.7%) for 928 yards with a 98.8 rating, rushing 87 times for 457 (5.3 avg.) yards with eight touchdowns, catching eight passes for 98 yards with a TD and playing on special teams units until Brees' rib injury. Following Brees' injury, November 15, Hill went 3-1 in four starts.

- In 12 games with nine starts in 2021, providing value at quarterback on offense and special teams, he completed 78-of-134 passes for 978 yards with four touchdowns, carried 70 times for 374 yards (5.3 avg.) with a club-best five touchdowns, caught four passes for 52 yards and added a special teams stop.

- In 2022, Hill will assist the Black and Gold offense in multiple facets. Making his debut in that role, he contributed on both offense and special teams in the season opener at Atlanta, Hill carried four times for a club-best 81 yards (20.3 avg.), including a career-long 57-yard carry, as well as an 11-yard rushing touchdown on the same first quarter drive of his long run. Hill also caught a pass for a two-yard gain and contributed on multiple special teams units both on the coverage and return teams. Overall, he ranks second on the team in rushing with 68 carries for 449 yards (club-best 6.6 avg.) with a club-best five rushing touchdowns, seven catches for 66 yards with two scores, tied with fellow tight end Juwan Johnson for a team-high seven total touchdowns, while completing 11-of-17 passes for 216 yards with two touchdown throws and a 147.3 passer rating. With nine yards rushing on Saturday at Cleveland, Hill would surpass his prior career-high of 457 in 2020.

## RECORD BREAKER

In the October 9 39-22 win over Seattle, Hill put together one of the most impressive combined efforts by a Saint on both offense and special teams. Hill carried nine times for a career-high 112 yards (club-record 12.4 avg.) with a career

-high three touchdowns, including a career-long 60-yard rushing touchdown in the fourth quarter. In addition, he tossed a 22-yard touchdown pass to Trautman and returned three kickoffs to tie a career-high for a career-best 69 yards. He's also the first player since the NFL merger to register a kick return, two rushing touchdowns and a passing touchdown in the same game. Hill became the second player in franchise history with at least three rushing touchdowns and a passing touchdown in the same game, joining Archie Manning (at Chicago, 10/2/77). Hill's the third player ever to record at least 100 rushing yards, three rushing touchdowns and a touchdown pass in a single game, joining Ronnie Brown (September 21, 2008) and Pro Football Hall of Famer LaDainian Tomlinson (September 25, 2005). Hill now has 21 career rushing touchdowns, seven career touchdown receptions and nine career touchdown passes. He joins Tomlinson as the only players since 2000 with at least 20 rushing touchdowns, five receiving touchdowns

and five touchdown passes in their career.

In Sunday's 21-18 win over Atlanta, Hill played a pivotal role in both the running game and the passing game, rushing seven times for 30 yards to contribute to a 134-yard day on the ground for New Orleans and completing two passes for 80 yards, including a 68-yard touchdown to rookie wideout Rashid Shaheed. With Hill's touchodnw pass, he now has ten career passing touchdowns, 21 career rushing touchdowns and 11 receiving touchdowns (regular season and playoffs combined). The last player to reach touble-digit touchdowns in passing, rushing and receiving was Pro Football Hall of Famer Frank Gifford (1952-64).

## DEFENSIVE LINE

### CAMERON JORDAN

- New Orleans' first choice in the 2011 NFL Draft (24th overall) out of California, Jordan enjoyed another standout season in 2021, recording 59 tackles, 12.5 sacks for a loss of 75.5 yards, tied for seventh in the NFL, including 8.5 takedowns in the last four contests to lead the league over that period, six passes defensed and two forced fumbles. Jordan was selected to his seventh Pro Bowl, the most by a defensive Saint and second overall in team records. With 112.5 career sacks, Jordan is second on the Saints career sack list and 24th on the NFL's takedown list. He has headlined the only defense in the NFL to rank both in the top five in run defense and sacks over that period.

## JORDAN SACK NOTES

Jordan is ranked second on the club's all-time sack list, ranked 24th in National Football League record books, needing 2.5 to tie the franchise record currently held by Rickey Jackson. With a split on Saturday at Cleveland, he would move into a tie for 23rd all-time in NFL record books with Sean Jones and with one would take sole possession of 23rd.

## LINEBACKERS

### DEMARIO DAVIS

- This dependable and sure-tackling defender joined the New Orleans Saints in 2018 after spending his first six National Football League seasons with the New York Jets and Cleveland Browns. For his career, the Brandon, Miss. native has appeared in 174 career regular season games with 160 starts for the Jets (2012-15, 2017), Cleveland (2016) and the Saints (2018-), recording 1,194 stops (781 solo), 36 sacks, three interceptions, 49 passes defended, three forced fumbles, seven fumble recoveries and 24 special teams tackles.

- In 2018, Davis opened all 16 contests and led the team with 110 stops (74 solo), five sacks to lead the linebackers, four passes defended, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. Davis' abilities to diagnose and tackle played a key role in New Orleans ranking second in the NFL in opponent rushing yards per game and opponent rushing yards per play. Participating in the postseason for the first time, Davis led the defense with 22 stops (15 solo), an interception in the NFC Championship and a pass defense. In 2019, he posted 111 stops, ranked first on the club, four sacks, one interception and 11 passes defended to help spur the league's fourth-ranked run defense.

- In 2020, Davis filled up the stat sheet with a team-leading 119 tackles (74 solo), four sacks and six passes defended.

Davis became the first Saint to lead the team in tackles in three consecutive seasons since Jonathan Vilma (2008-10).

## DURABLE DEFENDER

Davis who had never missed a game in his career until December 27, 2021 vs. Miami due to COVID-19 protocols, ranks as one of the league's most durable defenders, while playing one of the game's most physically demanding positions. His 158 consecutive games played streak was the longest in the NFL by a position player and his 79 straight games started were the most at his position. In 2022, Davis is one of three starting defenders to open every contest.

**PETE WERNER**

• New Orleans selected this three-year starter from Ohio State in the second round of the 2021 NFL Draft. The Indianapolis native finished his college career playing in 47 career games with 35 starts, recording 185 tackles (111 solo), 16 stops for loss, four sacks, 11 passes defended, four forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Werner helped power the Buckeyes to the College Football Playoff championship game as a senior in 2020, when he was voted by Big Ten coaches as a first-team All-Conference selection and a Butkus Award semifinalist, posting 54 tackles, 2.5 stops for loss, one sack and two forced fumbles. Werner made his second career start Oct. 3 vs. the Giants and recorded a ten tackles. With 13 stops in Week Five at Washington, he became the first Saints rookie defender to reach double-digit totals in back-to-back games. He ranked fifth on the team with 59 tackles.

• Werner is enjoying a standout start to the 2022 season, starting all nine games at weakside linebacker and ranked second on the team, despite missing four games, with 77 tackles (55 solo), one stop for loss, two passes defended, two forced fumbles and one special teams tackle.

**SECONDARY****S TYRANN MATHIEU**

• This versatile, hard-hitting, playmaking safety and New Orleans native returned home, signing after the draft and brings extensive experience to the secondary. Mathieu was selected by the Arizona Cardinals in the third round (69th overall) in the 2013 NFL Draft out of LSU and has played for the Cardinals (2013-17), Houston Texans (2018) and Kansas City Chiefs (2019-21). In nine NFL seasons, he has played in 143 regular season games with 134 starts and has posted career totals of 675 tackles (571 solo), 41 stops for loss, ten sacks for a loss of 78 yards, 28 interceptions for 338 returns yards, three brought back for touchdowns, 89 passes defended, four forced fumbles, seven fumble recoveries and five special teams stops. Mathieu has been selected to three Pro Bowls, three *Associated Press* All-Pro teams and the Pro Football Hall of Fame's 2010's All-Decade Team.

**NOSE FOR THE BALL**

Saints safety Tyrann Mathieu comes to New Orleans after starting all 16 games he played in for Kansas City in 2021 and recording 76 tackles, one sack, a career-high three fumble recoveries, one sack and two interceptions to earn his second consecutive Pro Bowl selection. With a team-leading two picks and one fumble recovery, adding up to a team-best three takeaways to go with 70 tackles to ranked third on the team and first in the secondary, Mathieu's 28

picks since 2013 tie for third in the NFL.

•Originally a second round draft pick of the New York Jets in 2017 out of the University of Florida, Maye has is a six-year NFL veteran who has recorded career totals of 368 tackles (259 solo), 3.5 sacks, six interceptions, 26 passes defended, five forced fumbles and one fumble recovery in 70 career games, all starts. Despite missing five contests, Maye has recorded 60 tackles and one forced fumble to tie for fifth on the team in stops for the league's seventh ranked pass defense and 11th overall defense. Maye is coming off a pair of performances in back-to-back contests, where he has led the team with a total of 18 tackles, adding two passes defended in Sunday's win over Atlanta.

**CB MARSHON LATTIMORE**

•Selected by the Saints in the first round (11<sup>th</sup> overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft, Lattimore started all 13 games he appeared in. He totaled 53 tackles (44 solo), a forced fumble, one fumble recovery, five interceptions for 85 yards and 18 passes defended, as he became the youngest Saint (21 years old) ever selected to the Pro Bowl and was selected as the *Associated Press* NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year.

• In 2018, Lattimore opened all 16 contests and posted a career-high 59 tackles (49 solo), two interceptions, 12 passes defended, a club-best four forced fumbles, tied for fourth in the NFL and three fumble recoveries, returned for 91 yards, leading the team in takeaways and tied for the NFL lead in defensive fumble recoveries, the highest total among defensive backs.

- A standout 2019 campaign by Lattimore resulted in him being voted to the Pro Bowl, the only Saints cornerback to ever be selected multiple times. Lattimore started all 14 games he played in and posted 57 stops, one interception and ranked first on the team with 14 passes defended.

- In 2020, he posted a career-high 62 tackles (52 solo), two interceptions and 11 passes defended as he was voted to the Pro Bowl for the third time. High expectations follow in 2021 as he signed a long-term contract extension to lock up the lockdown corner in the New Orleans secondary.

- After signing a contract extension at the start of the season, Lattimore posted 68 stops, three picks, a career-high 19 passes defended, ranked third in the NFL and one fumble recovery, being selected to his fourth Pro Bowl.

## 2021 HIGHLIGHTS

Below were Lattimore's 2021 defensive highlights:

- In the September 26 28-13 win at New England, Lattimore picked off Patriots QB Mac Jones in the game's next to last play to seal the victory.

- In the Week Five win over Washington, Lattimore earned NFC Defensive Player of the Week honors, as he recorded a career-high six passes defended, the first time that occurred in the NFL since 2017 and tied for the second-highest total in the league since the 1992 season.

- In Week 13 vs. Dallas, Lattimore, posted eight tackles (five solo), a fourth quarter interceptions and a game-high three passes defended.

- In the Week 14 win at the New York Jets, Lattimore, recorded a game-high two passes defended and five tackles, as New York's longest reception in the contest went for only 27 yards.

- In the Week 15 9-0 win at Tampa Bay posted four solo tackles, two passes defended and his first fumble recovery of the season.

- After being selected to the Pro Bowl five days earlier, Lattimore posted a team-lead tying third interception in the third quarter vs. Miami on December 27.

With his 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> career rushing touchdown, Hill joins Walter Payton as only the second player in the Super Bowl era with 20 rushing touchdowns (21), eight passing touchdowns (nine) and six receiving touchdowns (seven). ### ATLANTA FALCONS VS NEW ORLEANS SAINTS SUNDAY, DEC. 18, 2022 • CAESARS SUPERDOME SAINTS POSTGAME NOTES

- The Saints defeated the Falcons, 21-18 to improve to 5-9 on the season and secured their second series sweep in the last three seasons against Atlanta. New Orleans, Atlanta and the Carolina Panthers all have 5-9 records in the NFC South. The Saints will return to action on December 24, when they play at the Cleveland Browns at noon CT. The contest will be regionally televised on CBS (locally on WWL 4).
- With the win Sunday, the Saints improve their regular season record in the series to 54-53, giving them a winning record against 12 franchises.
- New Orleans is on a three-game winning streak against the Falcons and are 2-3 against NFC South opponents this season.
- New Orleans improves their 2022 home record to 4-4 (including a Week Four contest vs. Minnesota in London), a 4-3 record at the Caesars Superdome.
- This is the fifth consecutive contest that New Orleans has surrendered 20 or fewer points. This is the third consecutive season that the Saints have had such a streak, which has occurred for the first time in franchise history.
- The Saints surrendered only 320 total net yards, including 89 net yards passing, the lowest total against an opponent this season.
- The New Orleans Saints have a 25-21 overall record against the Falcons at the Superdome.
- The Saints gained 348 total yards with 214 yards coming through the air and 134 on the ground.
- The Saints surrendered only 320 total net yards, including 89 net yards passing, the lowest total against an opponent this season.
- Quarterback **Andy Dalton** has a 3-0 record against Atlanta as a starter with Sunday being his first as a member of the New Orleans Saints. The first two came as a member of the Cincinnati Bengals in 2014 and 2018.
- Dalton was 11-of-17 passing with 151 yards and two touchdowns for a 132.2 passer rating. It is Dalton's fourth game this season throwing for multiple touchdowns.
- Dalton has only thrown seven interceptions in 2022 and four the first time in his career, he has not thrown an interception through four consecutive contests.
- Tight end **Taysom Hill** accounted for 110 total yards, including 2-of-2 passing for 80 yards and a 68-yard touchdown pass to rookie wide receiver **Rashid Shaheed**. Hill also contributed 30 rushing yards on seven carries.
- With Hill's touchdown pass, he now has ten passing touchdowns, 21 rushing touchdowns and 11 receiving touchdowns, including the playoffs. The last player to reach double digit touchdowns in passing, rushing, and receiving (including the playoffs) was Hall of Famer Frank Gifford (played from 1952-1964).
- Running back **Alvin Kamara** finished with 104 total yards from scrimmage, including a team-high 91 yards on 21 carries. Kamara also added 13 yards on two receptions.

- Kamara has 1,121 career total yards from scrimmage against the Falcons, the most by him against an opponent. Kamara now has the fourth-most career yards from scrimmage against Atlanta after surpassing Dalton Hilliard Sunday.
- Tight end **Juwan Johnson** totaled a season-high 67 yards on four catches and had two touchdowns to lead the receiving core.
- Johnson tallied his second multi-touchdown game of the season and the third of his career and leads the team with seven touchdown receptions. All seven touchdown catches have come in his last seven games.
- Wide receiver **Rashid Shaheed** had three receptions for a season-high 95 yards to lead the receivers and had the 68-yard touchdown in the win.
- Shaheed's 68-yard touchdown catch from Hill in the first quarter was the longest touchdown play of the season for the Saints. It was Hill's first pass attempt of the game and Shaheed's second receiving touchdown of the season.
- The Saints scored touchdowns on their first two offensive drives for the first time since a Christmas Day, 2020 victory over the Minnesota Vikings in the Caesars Superdome.
- New Orleans scored on the game's opening possession with a 10-play drive for 75 yards that took 4:54 off the clock.
- The drive featured two third and nine conversions, including a 19-yard touchdown connection from Dalton to Johnson.
- Dalton was 4-of-6 for 67 yards on the opening scoring drive, and Johnson hauled in two catches for 33 yards on the drive.
- After a three-and-out by the Saints defense, Hill threw a 68-yard touchdown pass to Shaheed on the second play of the drive to build a 14-0 lead.
- New Orleans' second scoring drive of the game was two plays for 73 yards and 50 seconds.
- In the first half, New Orleans gained 235 total yards with 167 yards coming through the air and 69 on the ground.
- The Black and Gold scored on their first possession of the second half with a 22-yard touchdown pass from Dalton to Johnson.
- The scoring drive was 11 plays, 75 yards, took 7:12 off the clock and was highlighted by a pair of third down conversions, just like the game's opening drive.
- The Saints defense collected four total sacks, eight pass deflections and had one takeaway after recovering a fumble.
- New Orleans held the Falcons to just 120 total yards and collected three sacks and five pass deflections in the first 30 minutes of play.
- The Saints defense sealed the game with defensive back **Justin Evans**' first forced fumble of his career and cornerback **Bradley Roby** recovering the ball with 2:03 left to play.
- With his fourth solo tackle of the day, linebacker **Demario Davis** reached 350 solo tackles in his career with the Black and Gold. Davis finished with a team-best eight total tackles, including six solo tackles bringing his career total to 352 solo tackles with the Saints.
- Safety **Marcus Maye** and defensive tackle **Shy Tuttle** both followed with seven total tackles apiece. Maye matched Davis' six solo tackles and had two pass deflections.
- Safety **Tyrann Mathieu** logged six tackles (all solo) and recorded his first sack of the season. Mathieu also has two pass deflections for the second time this season.
- Defensive end **Cameron Jordan** played in his 200<sup>th</sup> career game (regular season/postseason combined) on Sunday, surpassing linebacker Rickey Jackson in a tie for fourth in the club record books and moving into a tie for third with kicker Morten Andersen, the most games played by a

defensive Saint. Jordan joined quarterback Drew Brees, punter Thomas Morstead and Andersen as only the fourth Saint to play in 200 career contests with the club. Jordan played in his 189<sup>th</sup> career regular season game as a Saint, putting him in a tie for fifth in club record books with former Black and Gold defensive lineman Frank Warren.

- Rookie cornerback **Alontae Taylor** recorded four solo tackles and had three passes defended for the second time this season to now lead the team with ten.

(Opening Statement): "Look, it was a good win, division opponent. To get an opportunity to win a game like that, it was good to see. There's obviously a lot of things that need to be cleaned up, but it's much better to do that after a win. I do want to say one thing. One of the things we were thinking about throughout the game was really Dean Pees. I'm sure you guys all heard about it. I think he made it back to the stadium here. Just wanted to make sure the Falcons and he and his family knew we were thinking about him."

(On being able to convert on 3<sup>rd</sup>-and-1 and imposing will on an opponent): "Well, yeah. I think putting a team away when you have an opportunity to put them away, you have to be able to take advantage of that. It is frustrating because you do a lot of good things, and then you have an opportunity to put them away and you're not able to do it. Look, we didn't finish that last drive of the game like we wanted to, but yet, we took it down to 0:09 to go and no timeouts. It wasn't exactly what we were looking for, but it was fairly close. I felt like that third down play, I was hoping we would get a measurement on that."

(On if he consulted the booth before throwing the challenge flag): "I wanted to make sure our guys upstairs felt like it was a touchdown. They felt confident that it was. We put the challenge flag there, and it was a good win, a good challenge. Our guys upstairs did a good job there."

(On creating turnovers): "How about a huge one in a critical moment today? Look, I think it was (Justin Evans) who came over the top with a top-down punchout. We talk about that all the time in our building. That's how the ball comes out in our League. I thought he did a great job of punching the ball out. I believe it was (Bradley Roby) who was there to recover it. It was a huge play in the game."

(On putting together a plan to stop the Falcons' run game): "Listen, we need to win. You know what I mean? It's one thing, we all talk about run the ball, run the ball. Look, I don't think we tackled as well as we needed to today. What did they have? 80 yards passing? It's not about do you stop the run, do you stop the pass, do you do this, do you do that. It's do you win. That's what we did today. Their plan was to come in and run it, run it, run it, not try to put the young quarterback (Deshaun Watson) in difficult situations. Look, the runner (Tyler) Allgeier, I was impressed with him today. He's a tough, physical runner, but we did what we needed to do, defensively, to win the game."

(On Juwan Johnson's improvement this year): "Yeah, look (Juwan's) improved a lot. He works tirelessly to improve himself and to improve his game. It's good to see when guys work the way that he works and give the type of efforts that he gives. It's good to see him being able to kind of reap the fruits of that labor. That's part of what you enjoy about coaching."

(On the Saints' fumble up 11 points): "That's part of what we just talked about when you have a chance to put a team away. I think it was 14-3 at that time. We had a chance to potentially go up 21-3 at that point in the game. We have to protect the ball better in those situations, certainly."

(On the Taysom Hill touchdown pass to Rashid Shaheed): "There are some things that you do. What you don't know when Taysom (Hill) lines up at the quarterback position, you don't know exactly what you're going to see every time. We got the look we were looking for. I think (Rashid) Shaheed ran a great route. His speed is impressive. Taysom did a good job of putting the ball in a great spot, just over the top of the safety. We got the look we were looking for, and our guys executed. That's really what good football is really all about. It's a good play call. Right? But the execution is what they work (on all week). That was good to see."

(On if he was surprised Alontae Taylor's interception was overturned): "No, I wasn't, after I saw it on the big screen. I wasn't sure if he caught it in real life, and then I saw it on the big screen. I didn't know if there was going to be enough to overturn it, but it's tough on that kid. (Taylor) keeps making these plays. He's not getting credit for making these plays, but he's playing outstandingly."

(On the mood in the locker room): "It's good. It's hard to win in this League. Anytime you get one, it's a good feeling. We're going to enjoy this. We have about 24 hours to kind of soak it in, and then we have a short week to get ready to go up to Cleveland. It was a good win. Our guys deserve a lot of credit for battling the way they have battled all year long. They came out ready to play today, and we made enough plays to win."

(On Alontae Taylor's performance): "(Alontae) shows up every day with his hard hat on, ready to go to work. He listens to his coaches, and he tries to do it exactly the way he is being coached to do it."

He works extremely hard on studying the opponent and knowing what type of things to anticipate. That's what we're looking for. We're looking for guys who want to be coached. They want to do it the right way. They want to play hard. They want to work hard, and he does that. It's not a surprise that he's able to go out and execute on Sundays because he puts in the preparation."

(On the fight in the team and finding a way to win): "I'll tell you this, I'd say that playing hard doesn't guarantee you're going to win, but not playing hard guarantees you won't win. That's what this game's about. This game's about freaking effort, passion, energy, going out and giving everything you've got. I've never questioned whether our guys were going to do that or not. They've done that all year long. I think we did it at the end of the day."

(On the strategy with Alvin Kamara): "Yeah, and touches in a few different ways. I think we've got to continue to try to figure out creative ways to give (Kamara) the ball and do some things with him and let him affect the game."

#### WIDE RECEIVER RASHID SHAHEED

(on what happened before the game with Falcons Defensive Coordinator Dean Pees) “I was backing up to catch a punt and kind of bumped into him (Dean Pees). I turned around and saw him stretched out so immediately I was concerned, but I got word that he’s back, he’s healthy and doing okay so I am thankful for that. If he sees this, I am sorry- my apologies.”

(on what his 40 time would be if he ran one today) “I don’t know. Hopefully anything 4.3 or below. I feel like that’s pretty fast. Hopefully something around there.”

(on closing out the season and playing with passion after a tough loss against the Buccaneers on Monday Night Football) “This was exactly how we needed to come out and play. Coach (Dennis Allen) preached it all week: coming out with energy and making them match our energy. We came out and got ahead early and carried that throughout the game. It was definitely a good way to start (closing out the season strong).”

(on the long Touchdown reception and if he knew the ball was coming his way) “Yea. At line of scrimmage it was a “kill kill” situation depending on how their safeties were going to play it, but when we lined up and saw single high safety I knew the ball was coming to my side. I just tried to win my route and Taysom (Hill) threw a great ball and I was able to make a play on it”

(on areas of growth throughout season) “I feel like I made a tremendous jump. At first it was tough coming in learning a very complex playbook. But I trust the guys around me. They all help me and our coaches help me develop. Early on it was tough, but I’ve gotten more comfortable.”

(on young guys finishing strong and planting seeds for the future) “Finishing strong is what we have to do. Finish out these last four games. Continuing to come out like we did today: with energy and passion. Practicing hard- it all starts with practice. We have to come in and fix some stuff. Today wasn’t perfect, but we will go back and chalk it up and see what we can do better.”

(on the Defenses creeping up to the line of scrimmage with Taysom Hill at QB) “When Taysom (Hill) is in the backfield all eyes are on Taysom being the player he is. He does a great job realizing that (defenses crowding the line of scrimmage) and when the play was called it worked out great.”

#### TIGHT END JUWAN JOHNSON

(on his chemistry with Andy Dalton and mindset in the red zone) “It has been good. Getting into the red zone knowing that it has to be attack mode. We have been pretty good for the past couple years in the red zone. When we get down there, we know it means points. Coach (Pete Carmichael) has been really good dialing up plays in the red zone. We have a lot of guys who can put the ball in the end zone.”

(on his success in the red zone and his first touchdown of the game) “It really is just hard work, watching film and going over the plays. I just try to see what coverages the defense is running. It’s not so much the physical aspect. It’s knowing what the defense is trying to do against us and being two steps ahead. The physical aspect is secondary. Before the play I pointed at him because I knew he was going to lead me inside.”

(on first TD) “It was just a simple shallow cross. I was bumping. They were playing in. I’m sure it was a busted coverage but nobody covered me and as they say “I just try to get freaky”. There aren’t too many times I get to run in the open field so I just tried to get in the end zone.”

(on the biggest key to success at tight end position) “You have got to have attitude. To play this position- you cannot be soft at all. You are going up some big guys up front (on the defensive line) and then in the secondary you’re playing against elite athletic guys. You have got to have the attitude that you can’t be stopped. That is the mindset I try to have. Ultimately, have attitude, be willing to learn, and be coachable. It’s a tough position (tight end) and you’ve got to be very smart to play it.”

(on whether undrafted guys like he and Shaheed play with a chip on their shoulder) “Absolutely- just knowing that you’ve been overlooked throughout the whole draft gives you an extra boost. Knowing teams passed up on you and being a UDFA (undrafted free agent). Playing with that mindset and knowing that you’ve got to “get it out the mud” and grind for it.”

## **CORNERBACK BRADLEY ROBY**

(on recovering the fumble late in the fourth Quarter) “It felt good. Towards the end the game I kept telling myself, you are going to make a play. I did not really make the play. Justin (Evans) made a great play. He made a big hit and the ball just came right to me.”

(on limiting Atlanta’s pass offense and facing a new rookie quarterback (Desmond Ridder) “We felt they weren’t going to change up too much offensively this late in the season. You talk about the pass game from my standpoint, obviously, you know, not where we want it to be. Some of those deep balls, you've got to give guys a chance to go make a play. (I) try to be too perfect on them (and) try to put it in front of them to try to make a perfect ball, when, in reality, all you've got to do is just give them a chance. That will be something I look back on and be able to work on."

On his mental state from the start of the game to later in the game: "Obviously, you are going to have nerves, anxiety, whatever it may be, just going out there (for your) first start. (It's) a crazy environment. Like I said earlier in the week, this is what all of us dream of, to come into the NFL and be able to start our first game. Obviously, there is a lot of emotions going on through that. Just being able to settle in and get going, obviously, that first drive, coming off (the field and) not being able to move the ball, and settling in (later), I think that really helped. It's just about being able to come out there and play efficiently."

On the Saints defense: "They did a good job in the back end. Like I said, our o-line did a phenomenal job of the run block and the pass block. I think all that it comes down to is winning one-one-one on the outside, which our guys did a lot of the time. Whether the ball placement wasn't there or my fundamentals were off a little bit. Like I said, I have just got to give the guys to make a chance (at a play)."

On when he settled down into the game: "Just after that first drive. The first drive, like I said, you've got emotions, you've got everything going. You just want to get out there and be perfect, go down there (on the) first drive 75 yards and score a touchdown. Obviously, that's not how it went. When we came off the sideline, I was like 'Ok, deep breath. Let's go back out there to work'."

On the last time he felt like this for a game: "I have not really processed the feelings of it yet. The emotions are down because we didn't get a win. We didn't play as well as we wanted to from a self-scouting standpoint. I think what this team has shown over this year is that we are fighters, and that is something to look forward to in the next three games and into next season. No matter if we are up or down by a whole bunch, this team is going to fight to the end, which is something that you can't take for granted."

On what he told Drake London after his turnover: "I saw him lying on the ground for a split-second too long. I sprinted over there to run and pick him up. You know, at the end of the day, he's going to look at that (turnover) and think that he would've caught that and we would have kept going and we would have scored, or whatever it may have been...and he thinks that one play is what may have broken the game, which is absolutely not true at all. Drake made a lot of great plays in that game. That one didn't go the way that we wanted to. I just told him that it doesn't matter, we're just going to go back to work. Don't hang your head on that. That's not who he is. You know he's excited to get back to work and come in tomorrow."

## **LB RASHAAN EVANS**

On the loss: “We started getting on a roll (in the second half), but at the end of the day, you always want to start fast and not give them an opportunity to win games. Anytime we can hold offenses to at least 21 (points) or lower, or even 14 or lower, that will, at least, give our offense a chance to win games. (The) defense, we just have to continue to move forward in the direction that we’re moving, continue to create turnovers and doing little things like that to keep offenses off of the field. I think that is the biggest thing (to winning).”

On describing some of the tough losses this season: “This is, kind of, one of the first situations that I’ve been in where every game is close; you lose every game that’s close. It gives you a good feeling of knowing that there is still some fight, (and) still opportunities to be able to win games. It’s just finding whatever that is to finish games. We just have to be able to make sure that we finish these next three games.”
