TITANS TRAVEL TO NEW ORLEANS TO OPEN 2023 REGULAR SEASON



Tennessee Titans (0-0) at New Orleans Saints (0-0)

Sunday, Sept. 10, 2023 • Noon CDT • Caesars Superdome • New Orleans, La. • TV: CBS

NASHVILLE — The Tennessee Titans (0-0) open the 2023 season this week with a trip to face the New Orleans Saints (0-0). Kickoff at the Caesars Superdome (73,000) is scheduled for noon CDT on Sunday, Sept. 10.

Sunday's showdown marks the second all-time season opener between the Titans and Saints franchises and the second in New Orleans. They met in the Crescent City on Sept. 5, 1993, when the Saints won 33-21 over the Oilers in a Sunday night contest.

The Titans head to New Orleans with a two-game winning streak in Week 1 road contests. They won at Cleveland and Denver in 2019 and 2020, respectively, before dropping their last two openers at home in 2021 (Arizona) and 2022 (New York Giants).

THE BROADCAST

The contest will be regionally televised on CBS, including Nashville affiliate WTVF NewsChannel 5, as well as on Paramount+ in the Nashville market. The broadcast team includes play-by-play announcer Chris Lewis, analysts Jason McCourty and Ross Tucker, and reporter Amanda Guerra.

Fans in Nashville can stream live Titans games on mobile devices with NFL+, which offers access to local games and all primetime games on phones and tablets. More information on ways to watch NFL games can be found here.

The Titans Radio Network and Nashville flagship 104.5 The Zone carry all Titans games across the Mid-South with the "Voice of the Titans" **Mike Keith**, analyst **Dave McGinnis**, sideline reporter **Ramon Foster** and gameday host **Rhett Bryan**.

Additionally, Sports USA will broadcast the game to a national radio audience. Play-byplay announcer John Ahlers and analyst Brandon Noble have the call.

VRABEL LEADS TITANS INTO 2023

The Titans, who went 2-1 during the preseason, are in their sixth season with head coach **Mike Vrabel** at the helm. Since being hired in 2018, the 2021 AP NFL Coach of the Year has directed the team to four winning records, three playoff appearances and two division titles.

Starting quarterback **Ryan Tannehill** enters his 12th year in the NFL and his fifth year with the organization. He ranks first in franchise history in career passer rating (100.5) and completion percentage (66.9), fifth in career passing touchdowns (89), and sixth in passing yards (12,831).

Three-time Pro Bowl running back **Derrick Henry** looks to continue his assault on the team's record books in his eighth pro season. Last year he moved into first place in franchise history in career rushing touchdowns (78) and total touchdowns (81), and he sits in third place on the franchise rushing charts with 8,335 career yards, behind only **Eddie George** (10,009) and **Earl Campbell** (8,574). Henry leads the NFL in rushing yards and rushing touchdowns since entering the NFL in 2016.

The Titans have multiple returning players who have earned Pro Bowl recognition during their time with the club: Tannehill, Henry, long snapper **Morgan Cox**, safety **Kevin Byard**, defensive tackle **Jeffery Simmons** and outside linebacker **Harold Landry III**. Prior to training camp, they signed five-time Pro Bowl wide receiver **DeAndre Hopkins**, who arrives in Tennessee with 853 career receptions—the most in the NFL over the past 10 seasons.

Additional veteran members of the roster scheduled to make their Titans regular-season debuts include outside linebacker Arden Key, linebacker Azeez Al-Shaair, cornerback Sean Murphy-Bunting and offensive linemen Daniel Brunskill and Andre Dillard. First-round offensive lineman Peter Skoronski (11th overall) headlines a six-member draft class.

THE SAINTS

The Saints were 2-1 during the preseason under **Dennis Allen**, who was named head coach in 2022 after serving six-and-a-half seasons as the team's defensive coordinator. He also was the head coach of the Oakland Raiders from 2012 to 2014.

In 2022, the Saints finished in third place in the NFC South with a 7-10 record, including wins in three of their last four games. They ranked fifth in total defense (314.8 yards per game), second in passing defense (184.4), ninth in scoring defense (20.3 points per game) and tied for fifth in sacks (48).

The Saints are led at quarterback by four-time Pro Bowler **Derek Carr**, who they signed as a free agent during the offseason. Carr previously spent nine seasons with the Raiders, starting 142 career games and passing for 35,222 yards and 217 touchdowns with a 91.8 career passer rating.

with three of those four contests played at Nissan Stadium. The last time the Titans played in New Orleans was Nov. 8, 2015, a game the Titans won in overtime by a final score of 34-28. It was the first game the Titans played under then-interim head coach Mike Mularkey. Rookie quarterback Marcus Mariota's fourth touchdown pass of the game

While the teams are infrequent adversaries and the Saints have made only four appearances in Tennessee since the Oilers moved from Houston in 1997, the Saints visited Nissan Stadium in 2019 and 2021.

SERIES HISTORY In head-to-head regular season matchups, the Titans and Saints have played a total of 16 times, with the Titans holding a 9-6-1 advantage. That includes a four-game winning streak by the Titans that was broken with a

Saints victory in 2011. The last four outcomes have been split evenly, 2-2,

QUICK CLICKS

On Dec. 22, 2019, the Saints erased a 14-0 Titans lead to win 38-28, defeating a Titans team that was without running back Derrick Henry for the first and only time during the season. Wide receiver Michael Thomas caught 12 passes from Drew Brees for 136 yards, including a late score to seal the New Orleans victory.

On Nov. 14, 2021, the Titans hosted the Saints and earned a 23-21 victory. The Titans defense tallied four sacks-including two sacks by Jeffery Simmons-and stopped the Saints on a late two-point conversion that would have tied the score at 23-23. Rvan Tannehill passed for a touchdown and rushed for another score in the win.

The Titans played a memorable primetime game at Caesars Superdome on Monday night, Sept. 24, 2007. Titans linebacker Keith Bulluck recorded a career-high three interceptions, tying a franchise record, in helping the team to a 31-14 win.

The initial regular season matchup between the Saints and the then-Houston Oilers occurred in 1971, five seasons after the Saints began play as an expansion franchise in the NFL. The game resulted in a 13-13 score, one of the six ties in Oilers/Titans history.

The Titans and Saints have a long preseason history. In 30 meetings in the preseason, the Saints lead 15-14-1. They met every preseason from 1968-87, and only the Dallas Cowboys have played the Oilers/Titans more often in the preseason (34 games) than the Saints.



WHAT TO LOOK FOR THIS WEEK

TENNESSEE TITANS

 The franchise launches its 25th season since becoming the Titans in 1999.

HEAD COACH MIKE VRABEL

Begins his sixth season as Titans head coach.

GENERAL MANAGER RAN CARTHON

> Begins his first season as Titans general manager.

S KEVIN BYARD

Needs one interception to break a four-way tie and gain sole possession of fourth place on the team's all-time career interceptions list. With 27 career interceptions, he is tied with **Tony Banfield**, **W.K. Hicks** and **Darryll Lewis** on the franchise chart.

LS MORGAN COX

Scheduled to appear in his 200th career regular-season game.

RB DERRICK HENRY

- Can record his 38th total 100-yard rushing game, including regular season (35) and playoffs (three). He would tie Eddie George (38 total) for the second-most such games in franchise history, trailing only Earl Campbell (40). His 35th such regular-season game would tie Chris Johnson's mark for the third-most in franchise history, behind only Campbell (39) and George (36).
- Can register his fifth consecutive 100-yard rushing game, dating back to the 2022 season. It would tie his career-best streak in regular-season games (2021 and 2022) and tie for the fourth-best streak in franchise history.
- Needs 240 rushing yards (currently at 8,335 for his career) to pass Earl Campbell (8,574) for second place on the team's all-time rushing list. He would trail only Eddie George (10,009).
- Needs two rushing touchdowns to reach 80 for his career.
- With six career 200-yard rushing games, he needs one more to surpass Adrian Peterson (six) and O.J. Simpson (six) for the most such games all-time.

WR DeANDRE HOPKINS

- Scheduled to make his Titans debut.
- Has an active streak of 145 consecutive games with a reception—every game since he has played since he entered the NFL. It is the longest active streak in the NFL.

OLB HAROLD LANDRY III

Expected to make his first appearance in the regular season since 2021. He missed the entire 2022 campaign due to injury.

DT JEFFERY SIMMONS

> Can register his third consecutive Week 1 game with at least one sack.

QB RYAN TANNEHILL

- Scheduled to begin his fifth season in Tennessee and his fourth season as the opening-game starter at quarterback.
- > Can record his 26th career 300-yard passing game.
- With 12,831 passing yards as a member of the Titans, he needs 377 yards to pass Marcus Mariota (13,207) for fifth place on the franchise's all-time passing list.

NOTABLE PERFORMANCES VS. THE SAINTS

WR DeANDRE HOPKINS

On 9/9/19 at New Orleans, Hopkins recorded eight receptions for 111 yards and two touchdowns for the Houston Texans.

K NICK FOLK

On 11/3/13 against New Orleans, Folk made went four-for-four on field goals and two-for-two on extra points in the win for the New York Jets. It was the fifth time in his career he had hit four field goals in a single game.

DT NAQUAN JONES

On 11/14/21 against New Orleans, Jones recorded one tackle and one sack for a seven-yard loss. It was the first sack of his career.

OLB HAROLD LANDRY III

On 11/14/21 against New Orleans, Landry posted five tackles and one sack for a three yard loss in the win for the Titans.

CB SEAN MURPHY-BUNTING

- In seven career games against the Saints as a member of the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, Murphy-Bunting had 28 tackles and two interceptions.
- On 10/6/19 at New Orleans, Murphy-Bunting recorded four tackles and his first career interception. He returned the interception 14 yards. The Buccaneers scored a touchdown two plays later.
- On 1/17/21 at New Orleans in the divisional round of the playoffs, Murphy-Bunting recorded five tackles and one interception en route to the Buccaneers' Super Bowl victory. It was the second consecutive game in which he recorded an interception. Murphy-Bunting picked off QB Drew Brees and returned it 36 yards to set up Tampa Bay with firstand-goal on the three-yard line. The Buccaneers scored a touchdown on the next play to take a 10-6 lead.

LB MONTY RICE

On 11/14/21 against New Orleans, Rice had 10 total tackles, the most of his career at the time.

DT JEFFERY SIMMONS

On 11/14/21 against New Orleans, Simmons recorded four tackles and two sacks. It was the first two-sack game of his career.

QB RYAN TANNEHILL

On 12/22/19 against New Orleans, Tannehill completed 17 of 27 passes for 272 yards and three touchdowns for a 133.6 passer rating, tossing a game-long 41-yard touchdown pass to TE Jonnu Smith.

TITANS-SAINTS: THE LAST MEETING



2021 Week 10: Titans 23, Saints 21 Sunday, Nov. 14, 2021 • 12:00 p.m. CT • Nissan Stadium

In Week 10 of the 2021 season, the Titans hosted the Saints and won by a score of 23-21. This marked Tennessee's sixth consecutive win, as they became the second team in NFL history to win five straight contests with each of the wins coming at the expense of a participant in the previous year's postseason.

The Titans got on the board in the first quarter with a 70-yard scoring drive that included a 50-yard pass from QB Ryan Tannehill to WR Marcus Johnson. K Randy Bullock converted a 28-vard field goal to give Tennessee an early 3-0 lead.

In the second quarter, New Orleans strung together a 75-yard scoring drive that incorporated a 46-vard pass from Saints QB Trevor Siemian to Saints WR Deonte Harris to move the chains. Ultimately, Siemian threw an 11-yard touchdown to Saints WR Tre'Quan Smith, but the extra point attempt failed as New Orleans took a 6-3 lead. On the ensuing Tennessee possession, Tannehill completed first-down-converting passes to TE Geoff Swaim and Johnson to extend the drive, before Bullock tied the score at 6-6 with a 36-yard field goal.

Later in the second quarter, Tennessee pulled ahead with a 56-yard scoring possession. WR A.J. Brown contributed a first-down catch and a first-down carry, which then allowed Tannehill to rush for a one-yard score. The Titans went ahead 13-6.

On New Orleans' opening kick return of the second half, LB Dylan Cole forced Harris to fumble the ball. FB Tory Carter recovered it to give Tennessee possession at the New Orleans 19-yard line. Johnson contributed a 10-yard catch, as Tannehill then connected with TE MyCole Pruitt for a two-yard touchdown. The Titans increased the lead, 20-6. Later in the third quarter, New Orleans scored their first of two touchdowns on the day as RB Mark Ingram II ran in a 13-yard score. However, Saints K Brian Johnson missed his second extra point of the day, as New Orleans made it a 20-12 contest.

In the fourth quarter, Tennessee tacked on another score on an 11-play possession that included a 39-yard screen pass from Tannehill to RB D'Onta Foreman. Bullock converted his third field goal of the day on a successful 36-yard kick, 23-12 Titans. On the following possession, New Orleans responded with a field goal of their own. Siemian connected with Ingram for a 34-yard pass, as Johnson completed the drive with a 20-yard field goal to make it 23-15.

Later in the fourth guarter. New Orleans constructed a 71-play scoring drive that culmi



Dennis Allen enters his second season as head coach of the New Orleans Saints after being named the 17th head coach in franchise history on Feb. 8, 2022.

In his first year as head coach of the Saints, Allen guided New Orleans through the challenge of significant injuries at virtually every position to win three of their last four games after a Week 14 bye and give up 20 or fewer points in the final eight contests of the season. The team's defensive play-caller since the middle of the 2015 season, New Orleans ranked second in the NFL in pass defense (184.4 yards per game) fifth in total defense (314.8), tied for fifth in sacks (48) and ninth in scoring defense (20.3 points per game) in 2022. Linebacker **Demario Davis** and defensive end **Cameron Jordan** were each named to the Pro Bowl while Davis earned AP (second-team) honors.

Also in 2022, the team's top draft selection, wide receiver **Chris Olave**, earned PFWAAll-Rookie recognition, as he led the team in receiving with 72 receptions for 1,042 yards. Running back **Alvin Kamara** became the only player to currently have six consecutive seasons of at least 1,300 yards from scrimmage.

Prior to returning to the Saints in 2015, Allen served as the head coach of the Oakland Raiders from 2012-14.

In 2011, Allen served as defensive coordinator of the Denver Broncos. He led a defense that helped the Broncos win the AFC West division crown and advance to the AFC Divisional round. The defense produced four Pro Bowl selections as rookie linebacker **Von Miller** joined cornerback **Champ Bailey**, safety **Brian Dawkins** and defensive end **Elvis Dumervil**.

During his first stint in New Orleans, Allen was a part of a defensive coaching staff that from 2009 to 2010 helped the club go 24-8 in the regular season, qualify for the playoffs both times and capture Super Bowl XLIV. He joined the Saints as a defensive line assistant/quality control coach before serving as an assistant defensive line coach from 2006-07 and secondary coach from 2008-10. From 2002-2005, he assisted in coaching the defensive backfield with the Atlanta Falcons.

Allen worked as the secondary coach for the University of Tulsa (2000-01) before heading to the NFL. Prior to his stint at Tulsa, Allen was on the coaching staff for four years (1996-99) at his alma mater, Texas A&M, as a graduate assistant working primarily with the school's secondary.

A native of Hurst, Texas, Allen earned four letters for Texas A&M as a safety from 1992-95 and started the final 21 games of his career.



Preseason Week 3: Titans 23, Patriots 7 Friday, Aug. 25, 2023 • 7:15 p.m. CT • Nissan Stadium

The Titans closed out the 2023 preseason with a 23-7 win at home over the New England Patriots. Tennessee's defense was able to hold the Patriots to just 79 total yards of offense while the Titans racked up 368 yards to conclude the preseason with a 2-1 record

The Titans booted field goals in back-to-back possessions in the first quarter to jump out to a 6-0 lead. The first field goal came after a seven-play, 51-yard drive that included a 32-yard pass interference penalty on the Patriots that put the Titans at the New England 46-yard line. QB Malik Willis then connected with WR Nick Westbrook-Ikhine on a 22-yard pass. K Michael Badgley finished the drive with a 44-yard field goal, his first as a Titan. After a touchback on the ensuing kickoff, QB Bailey Zappe was stripsacked by DL Denico Autry. DL Jayden Peevy recovered the football at the New England 13-yard line and returned it down to the five. The Titans were unable to find the end zone, but Badgley made the 27-yard field goal.

At the end of the first quarter, Willis was intercepted by LB Calvin Munson giving the Patriots the ball at the Titans 38-vard line. Zappe connected with WR Thyrick Pitts for a 23-yard gain before being brought down at the five-yard line. RB Kevin Harris ran it in for a touchdown on the next play to give the Patriots a 7-6 lead early in the second quarter

On the next possession, the Titans drove down to the New England 21-yard line, but were unable to convert it to any points after Badgley missed the 39-yard field goal attempt. Tennessee got the ball back at its own 10-vard line after forcing a Patriots punt and strung together a 10-play, 90-yard touchdown drive highlighted by two 30-yard completions from Willis to WR Colton Dowell and RB Julius Chesnut. Chestnut caught the . 12-yard touchdown pass to put the Titans back on top 13-7 to end the first half.

After a scoreless third quarter, the Titans scored on the second play of the fourth quarter after Willis guided the team on a 10-play, 83-yard drive capped off by a 26-yard touchdown pass to WR Kearis Jackson to take a 23-7 lead.

Tennessee finished off the scoring with 3:01 left in the game with a 33-yard field goal from Badglev.

KICKOFF WEEKEND

This is the second all-time meeting between the Titans and Saints franchises on Kickoff Weekend. In 1993, the Oilers visited the Saints in Week 1 on Sunday Night Football and fell by a final score of 33-21.

The Titans have won two of their five openers under head coach **Mike Vrabel**. In 2022, the New York Giants visited Nissan Stadium and handed the Titans a 21-20 defeat after **Saquan Barkley** scored the go-ahead two-point conversion for the Giants with 1:06 remaining in the fourth quarter and the Titans missed a 47-yard field goal as time expired.

Vrabel's two season-opening wins came on the road victories in 2019 over the Cleveland Browns and in 2020 over the Denver Broncos in a late Monday night game.

In 2018, Vrabel made his debut as head coach with the Titans in a 27-20 loss at Miami in what became an NFL-record setting affair of more than seven hours due to a pair of weather stoppages.

Vrabel was 9-5 on Kickoff Weekend in 14 seasons as an NFL player, and during his NFL assistant coaching tenure with the Houston Texans from 2014–2017, his teams went 2-2 in Week 1 games.

The Titans are 32-31 all-time as a franchise in Week 1, including a 5-7 Kickoff Weekend record at Nissan Stadium.

Since the NFL went to a 16-game schedule in 1978 (now a 17-game schedule as of 2021), the Titans have won their opener 22 times. In those seasons, they have made the playoffs 11 times (50.0%) and missed the playoffs 11 times (50.0%). The Titans have lost their opener 23 times since 1978, and in those seasons, they have made the playoffs nine times (39.1%) and missed the playoffs 14 times (60.9%).

2023 SCHEDULE NOTES

SEASON NOTES

- PLAYOFF OPPONENTS: The Titans have eight total games against seven playoff teams from last season. They play three division champions from 2022, including home games against Cincinnati (Oct. 1) and Jacksonville (Jan. 6 or 7) and visits to Tampa Bay (Nov. 12) and Jacksonville (Nov. 19). The four contests against 2022 wild card qualifiers include home dates with the Los Angeles Chargers (Sept. 17) and Seattle Seahawks (Dec. 24), a road game against Miami (Dec. 11), and a game in London against Baltimore (Oct. 15). The eight games against reigning playoff clubs are one more than the number the Titans had in 2022.
- NATIONAL TV APPEARANCES: The Titans are currently scheduled for three nationally-televised games. Their game in London against Baltimore (Oct. 15) will air on NFL Network. In primetime, they play at Pittsburgh on Thursday Night Football (Nov. 2 on Prime Video) and at Miami on Monday Night Football (Dec. 11 on ESPN).
- TV BREAKDOWN: Excluding their Week 18 matchup with the Jaguars, which has not yet been assigned a television broadcasting network, the Titans are currently scheduled for 10 contests on CBS, three games on FOX, and one game each on NFL Network, ESPN and Prime Video. Due to the NFL's flex scheduling, some contests could be moved to a different network from the one appearing on the initial schedule.
- TIME (ZONE) TRAVEL: Outside of their trip to London, the Titans stay in either the central time zone (13 games) or eastern time zone (six) for the duration of 2023, including the preseason. The farthest west they travel is Houston.
- HIGH NOON: During the regular season, 13 of the Titans' games are currently scheduled for Sundays at noon CT, with 11 total contests subject to flex scheduling.
- THREE GAMES BASED UPON 2022 FINISH: Every NFL team has two intraconference games and one interconference matchup based on the previous year's standings. As a result of the Titans' second-place finish in 2022, they host the AFC West's second-place Chargers (Sept. 17) and the NFC West's secondplace Seattle Seahawks (Dec. 24). They visit the AFC East's runner-up Dolphins (Dec. 11). Overall, the Titans' strength of schedule is .448 (127-157-4) based upon their opponents' combined 2022 record, which is the 28th most difficult in the NFL.
- FACING TOP OFFENSES AND DEFENSES: The Titans the NFL's top 10 face four of offenses from last season: Cincinnati (Oct. 1, eighth-overall offense), Jacksonville (Nov. 19 and Jan. 6-7, 10th), the Los Angeles Chargers (Sept. 17, ninth) and Miami (Dec. 11, sixth). They also contend with three of the top 10 defenses from 2022: Baltimore (Oct. 15, tied-ninth overall defense), New Orleans (Sept. 10, fifth) and Tampa Bay (Nov. 12. tied-ninth).
- VRABEL LOOKS FOR FIFTH WINNING SEASON: With a winning record in 2023, Mike Vrabel would join Bum Phillips and Jeff Fisher as the only head coaches in franchise history with at least five winning campaigns. Under Vrabel, the Titans finished with winning records each season from 2018 to 2021. Fisher holds the franchise record for head coaches with six winning seasons (1999-00, 2002-03, 2007-08), which broke the previous record of five seasons, established by Phillips (1975, 1977-80).
- VRABEL COULD PASS PHILLIPS: Entering 2023 with a record of 50-37 as head coach, including playoffs, Mike Vrabel needs 10 wins to pass Bum Phillips (59-38) for second place on the franchise's all-time wins list among head coaches. Jeff Fisher (147-126) holds the franchise record for wins.
- HEAD COACHING EXPERIENCE: The Titans will face three of the five NFL head coaches who were hired by their respective clubs in 2023: Indianapolis' Shane Steichen (Oct. 8 and Dec. 3), Carolina's Frank Reich (Nov. 26) and Houston's DeMeco Ryans (Dec. 17 and 31). Titans head coach Mike Vrabel, who joined the Titans in 2018, has the ninth-longest tenure among current head coaches.

WEEK-BY-WEEK NOTES

- WEEK 1 at NEW ORLEANS: In the season opener, the Titans trek to the Caesars Superdome for the first time since 2015, facing a Saints team that ranked fifth in overall defense and second in passing defense in 2022 under head coach Dennis Allen. During the offseason, New Orleans signed veteran quarterback Derek Carr, who spent his first nine NFL campaigns with the Raiders. The visit to New Orleans will mark the second time that the Titans franchise has played New Orleans in Week 1. The first such occurrence was a 33-21 Saints victory on Sunday night, Sept. 5, 1993.
- WEEK 2 vs. LOS ANGELES CHARGERS: The last time the Titans hosted the Chargers in their home opener was Sept. 22, 2013, which resulted in a 20-17 Titans victory. It was the first of two consecutive Titans wins in the series at Nissan Stadium, which most recently included quarterback Ryan Tannehill's first start with the organization on Oct. 20, 2019. The Chargers, who defeated the Titans at SoFi Stadium in 2022, enter their fourth season with quarterback Justin Herbert, the sixth-overall pick in the 2020 NFL Draft. The contest will be the 200th combined Titans regular season and postseason game at Nissan Stadium.
- WEEK 3 at CLEVELAND: The Titans have won their last two games at Cleveland Browns Stadium (2017 and 2019), but the Browns, under head coach Kevin Stefanski, won the most recent clash at Nissan Stadium in 2020. Browns quarterback Deshaun Watson has several connections with the Titans from their shared time at the Houston Texans, including head coach Mike Vrabel and offensive coordinator Tim Kelly.

- WEEK 4 vs. CINCINNATI: The Titans look to snap a three-game skid against the Bengals, who are led by fourth-year quarterback Joe Burrow. The Bengals took the AFC North title in each of the past two seasons and defeated the Titans at Nissan Stadium in the 2021 divisional playoffs. The Titans lead the all-time series 40-37-1, including the postseason.
- WEEKS 5 & 13 vs. INDIANAPOLIS: The Titans enter 2023 with a five-game winning streak over the Colts, who are led by first-year head coach Shane Steichen. Steichen served as the offensive coordinator of the Philadelphia Eagles the last two seasons, and in 2022 he helped the team reach Super Bowl LVII. First-year Titans general manager Ran Carthon spent the majority of his three NFL seasons as a player (2004-06) with the Colts.
- WEEK 6 vs. BALTIMORE (LONDON): The Titans and Ravens square off at London's Tottenham Hotspur Stadium, marking the Titans' second all-time international game in the regular season. Their first such trip occurred in 2018, Mike Vrabel's first year as head coach, when the Titans faced the Chargers at Wembley Stadium. The Titans and Ravens have developed a heated rivalry over the course of 26 all-time meetings since the series originated in 1996, highlighted by five postseason contests—most recently a 20-13 Ravens wild-card victory on Jan. 10, 2021. No team has faced the Titans/Oilers more than the Ravens in postseason history, despite the first such matchup not occurring until January 2001. Including all regular season and postseason games, the series is tied 13-13.
- WEEK 7 (BYE): The Titans follow their trip to London with a bye. Since Mike Vrabel became the team's head coach in 2018, the Titans are 5-0 in games immediately following their bye week.
- WEEK 8 vs. ATLANTA: Falcons head coach Arthur Smith faces the Titans for the first time since leaving the organization in 2021 to claim his current post. Smith was with the Titans from 2011 to 2020, including time as offensive coordinator in his final two campaigns with the club. The trip to Nissan Stadium by the Falcons will be their fourth in the regular season.
- WEEK 9 at PITTSBURGH (THURSDAY NIGHT): The Titans renew the series in the 81st meeting (including playoffs) with their former AFC Central rivals, who are in their 17th season with Mike Tomlin as head coach. In franchise history, the Titans/Oilers have played the Steelers more than any other opponent, including a 2-2 split in four previous Thursday night encounters. Titans head coach Mike Vrabel spent four seasons as a player in Pittsburgh after being selected by the Steelers in the third round of the 1997 NFL Draft.
- WEEK 10 at TAMPA BAY: The Titans carry a three-game winning streak over the Buccaneers into the meeting. With Todd Bowles in his second season as Tampa Bay's head coach, the team moves forward at quarterback in 2023 with veterans Baker Mayfield and Kyle Trask following the offseason retirement of Tom Brady.
- WEEKS 11 & 18 vs. JACKSONVILLE: The Titans look to regain the momentum in the series after they were swept by the Jaguars in 2022 for the first time since 2005. That ended the Titans' five-game winning streak in the rivalry. In Week 18 of last season, the Jaguars defeated the Titans in Jacksonville in a matchup that decided the AFC South champion. The Jaguars are in their second campaign with Doug Pederson as head coach and their third season since selecting quarterback Trevor Lawrence with the first pick in the 2021 NFL Draft.
- WEEK 12 vs. CAROLINA: The Titans will host the Panthers at Nissan Stadium for only the third time in the regular season (2007 and 2015). The Panthers are launching a new era in 2023 with head coach Frank Reich, who previously served as the head coach at the Indianapolis Colts from 2018 to 2022. Former Alabama quarterback and Heisman Trophy winner Bryce Young was selected by the Panthers with the first pick in the 2023 NFL Draft.
- WEEK 14 at MIAMI (MONDAY NIGHT): Titans quarterback Ryan Tannehill is scheduled to make his first appearance at Hard Rock Stadium since being traded from the Dolphins to the Titans in 2019. Over his seven seasons in Miami (2012-18), he started 88 games and threw for 20,434 yards and 123 touchdowns. The Titans defense faces a Dolphins offense directed by second-year head coach Mike McDaniel that ranked sixth overall and fourth in passing in 2022. The last time the Titans traveled to Miami was the 2018 season opener, Mike Vrabel's first game as a head coach. With a duration of 7 hours and 8 minutes due to two separate weather interruptions, the 27-20 Dolphins win became the longest game in NFL history. The Titans franchise is 25-19 all-time on Monday Night Football, including a 2-0 mark against the Dolphins. In 1978, the Oilers and the Dolphins were featured in a memorable Monday night clash, a 35-30 Oilers win that included 199 yards and four rushing touchdowns by Earl Campbell.
- WEEKS 15 & 17 vs. HOUSTON: The Titans and Texans play twice in a threeweek span. They have split the season series in six of the last seven years. This year the Titans face new Texans head coach DeMeco Ryans, who was hired in 2023 after serving two seasons as defensive coordinator for the San Francisco 49ers. Titans running back Derrick Henry enters the season with five consecutive games against the Texans with at least 126 rushing yards and one touchdown. The Texans drafted former Ohio State quarterback C.J. Stroud with the second overall pick in the 2023 NFL Draft. Prior to training camp, the Titans added veteran wide receiver DeAndre Hopkins, a first-round pick in 2013 who spent his first seven NFL seasons with the Texans.
- WEEK 16 vs. SEATTLE: The Titans have won two consecutive games against the Seahawks and three of the last four meetings. Most recently, Derrick Henry rushed for 182 yards and three touchdowns in a 33-30 overtime victory at Seattle on Sept. 19, 2021. Pete Carroll's 14 seasons as head coach with the Seahawks gives him the fourth-longest tenure in the NFL behind only New England's Bill Belichick, Pittsburgh's Mike Tomlin and Baltimore's John Harbaugh.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR - TEAM

- > The franchise is in its 25th season since becoming the Titans in 1999.
- > The Titans can earn their fifth playoff berth in a seven-year span.
- The Titans can earn their third division title in a four-year span. The only other stretch in franchise annals with three division titles in a four-year span was when the Oilers won the AFL East in 1960, 1961 and 1962.
- Entering 2022 with a record of 110-83 in regular season games at Nissan Stadium, the Titans need four wins at home to exceed the 113 wins the franchise had in regular season contests at the Astrodome (113-103-2). With a record of 112-87 in the regular season and postseason combined at Nissan Stadium, the Titans are five total wins from exceeding the 116 total wins the Oilers had at the Astrodome (116-105-2). That would give the franchise more victories at Nissan Stadium than any other single venue.
- The Titans are scheduled to play their 200th combined regular season and postseason game at Nissan Stadium when they face the L.A. Chargers there on Sept. 17. Their 200th regular season game at Nissan Stadium is slated for Dec. 24 against the Seattle Seahawks.

HEAD COACH MIKE VRABEL

- Mike Vrabel is 50-37 as head coach of the Titans, including the regular season and playoffs. With 10 more wins, he will pass Bum Phillips (59) for second place on the franchise's all-time list for wins by a head coach. He would trail only Jeff Fisher (147).
- Can join Jeff Fisher (six) and Jack Pardee (four) as the only head coaches to lead the franchise to at least four playoff appearances.

<u>S KEVIN BYARD</u>

- Needs one interception in 2023 (27 interceptions entering the season) to move into sole possession of fourth place on the all-time franchise interception list. He is tied with **Tony Banfield**, **W.K. Hicks** and **Darryll** Lewis.
- Needs three interceptions to tie Fred Glick (30) for third place all-time for the franchise.
- Needs four interceptions to tie Cris Dishman (31) and five interceptions to pass Dishman for second place all-time for the franchise. He would trail only Jim Norton (45).
- Can set a franchise record by leading the team in interceptions for a sixth time (2017-19, 2021-22). His five such seasons tied **Darryll Lewis'** franchise record (1994-98).
- Can become the first player to lead the team in tackles for four consecutive seasons since Keith Bulluck (2002-06).
- With a streak of 114 consecutive games played (regular season) entering 2023, Byard can pass Eddie George (128) for the 10th-longest consecutive games streak in franchise history by playing in the first 15 games of 2023.
- With a streak of 114 consecutive games played (regular season) to begin his career, Byard can pass Eddie George (128) for the sixthlongest such streak in franchise history by playing in the first 15 games of 2023. He would trail only Robert Brazile (147), Rob Bironas (144), Beau Brinkley (135), Elvin Bethea (135) and Gregg Bingham (134).

RB DERRICK HENRY

- Currently at 8,335 career rushing yards, he needs 240 rushing yards to eclipse Earl Campbell (8,574) for second place on the franchise's alltime career rushing list.
- Needs 1,675 rushing yards to surpass Eddie George (10,009) as the franchise's all-time rushing leader.
- Needs 1,665 rushing yards to reach 10,000 for his career. Thirty-one previous NFL players have reached the plateau.
- Needs 2,000 rushing yards to become the first player in NFL history to reach the mark in two different seasons.
- Needs 10 rushing touchdowns to become the third player in NFL history to reach the mark in six consecutive seasons, joining LaDainian Tomlinson (nine) and Adrian Peterson (seven).

- With six career 200-yard rushing games, he needs one more to surpass Adrian Peterson (six) and O.J. Simpson (six) for the most such games all-time.
- Needs 1,500 rushing yards to become the fifth player in NFL history to reach the mark in four career seasons, joining Barry Sanders (five), Eric Dickerson (four), Edgerrin James (four) and Walter Payton (four).
- Needs 1,500 rushing yards and 15 rushing touchdowns to become the first player in NFL history to reach both marks in three different seasons.

WR DeANDRE HOPKINS

- Enters 2023 with 853 career receptions for 11,298 yards. With 47 catches and 702 receiving yards, he can become the seventh player to reach 900 receptions and 12,000 receiving yards within his first 11 NFL seasons, joining Marvin Harrison, Jerry Rice, Brandon Marshall, Andre Johnson, Torry Holt and Larry Fitzgerald.
- Enters the 2023 season with a streak of 145 consecutive games with a reception—every game since he has played since he entered the NFL. It is the longest active streak in the NFL. With at least one catch in his next 14 appearances, he will surpass Marshall Faulk (158) to own the third-longest such streak to begin a career in the Super Bowl era (1966–present). He would trail only Marvin Harrison (190) and Keyshawn Johnson (167).
- Needs 47 receptions to reach 900 for his career (853 entering 2023). He would join 24 previous NFL players to accomplish the feat.

OLB HAROLD LANDRY III

Needs eight sacks (31.0 career sacks entering 2023) to surpass Kyle Vanden Bosch (38.5) for 11th place on the franchise's all-time career sack list. He also needs nine sacks to become the franchise's 11th player to reach 40 career sacks.

DT JEFFERY SIMMONS

Can become the team's only player since 2000 to record at least three sacks and five passes defensed in four consecutive seasons.

DT JEFFERY SIMMONS & DL DENICO AUTRY

Can join Jevon Kearse (1999-01) and Brian Orakpo (2015-17) as the franchise's only players since 1999 to produce three consecutive seasons with at least seven sacks.

P RYAN STONEHOUSE

Can become the first player in history to lead the NFL in punting average in each of his first two NFL seasons.

QB RYAN TANNEHILL

- Can produce his seventh career season with at least 3,000 passing yards and his third career season with at least 4,000 passing yards.
- Can join Warren Moon (six) and Steve McNair (four) as the only starting quarterbacks in franchise history to lead the club to the playoffs at least four times.
- Needs 3,500 passing yards to tie Warren Moon (1989–1991) for the most seasons in franchise history with at least 3,500 passing yards. Tannehill reached the mark in 2020 and 2021.
- Enters 2023 with 33,265 NFL passing yards and 212 touchdown passes. With 2,735 passing yards and 18 touchdown passes, he will join 27 previous players to reach 36,000 passing yards and 230 touchdown passes in an NFL career.
- With 12,831 passing yards with the Titans, he needs 377 yards to pass Marcus Mariota (13,207) for fifth place on the franchise's all-time passing list and needs 4,016 yards to pass Dan Pastorini (16,846) for fourth place.
- With 89 touchdown passes with the Titans, he needs eight touchdown passes to surpass **Dan Pastorini's** total (96) for fourth place all-time for the franchise. With 11 touchdown passes, he will become the fourth passer in team annals to reach 100 with the team, joining **Warren Moon** (196), **George Blanda** (165) and **Steve McNair** (156).

Ran Carthon was named the 14th general

manager in franchise history on Jan. 18, 2023. He joined the Titans after spending six seasons with the San Francisco 49ers, including the last two as the team's director of player personnel.

"We are excited to add Ran to our organization as our new general manager," Titans controlling owner Amy Adams Strunk said upon announcing the hire. "He brings a variety of valuable experiences to our team - as a former player and a successful personnel executive for multiple teams. I was impressed with his natural leadership qualities and his ability to connect with people. With talent evaluation being critical to this role, the roster they have built in San Francisco stands out. He played an important role there constructing one of our league's best teams."

Carthon arrived bringing a range of experience from multiple teams to Tennessee. While in San Francisco, he was the 49ers director of pro personnel for four seasons (2017-20) and then promoted to director of player personnel in 2021, serving in that capacity until joining the Titans. In his role as director of player personnel, Carthon was responsible for evaluating the top college prospects and assisting in the construction of the pro free agent board and evaluations. He joined the 49ers when head coach Kyle Shanahan and general manager John Lynch took over in 2017 and played a part in the team's three playoff appearances, two division titles and an NFC championship in 2019. Additionally, the 49ers had nine players account for 13 total Pro Bowl selections from 2021 (seven selections) to 2022 (six selections)-evidence of the talented roster the personnel staff amassed

In his first offseason with the Titans, Carthon re-worked the roster adding wide receiver DeAndre Hopkins, tackle Andre Dillard, outside linebacker Arden Key, linebacker Azeez Al-Shaair, cornerback Sean Murphy-Bunting, tight end Trevon Wesco and linebacker Luke Gifford in free agency. In his first draft, offensive lineman Peter Skoronski and quarterback Will Levis were selected in the first two rounds.

Before joining San Francisco, Carthon spent five seasons (2012-16) with the St. Louis/Los Angeles Rams as their director of pro personnel. He entered the NFL scouting world as a pro scout with the Atlanta Falcons for four years (2008-11).

As a player, Carthon spent three seasons in the NFL (2004-06) primarily with the Indianapolis Colts, after entering the league as an undrafted college free agent. At the University of Florida, he tallied 1,353 career rushing yards over four seasons and was part of the Gators 2000 SEC Championship team.

Carthon was raised in an NFL family with his dad, Maurice, having a distinguished playing and coaching career. His father played for the New York Giants and Indianapolis Colts, and he coached for New England, New York Jets, Detroit, Dallas, Cleveland, Arizona and Kansas City.

Following his playing career, Carthon received his bachelor's degree in sociology from the University of Florida in 2008. As a member of the Rams (2013) and 49ers (2018) he was selected to participate in the NFL Career Development Symposium at the Wharton School of Business. And in 2022, he took part in the inaugural NFL coach and front office accelerator program.

Born Arandic Kornell Carthon in February of 1981, in Osceola, Ark., he attended Key West High School in Key West, Florida.

Phillips (three), **Jerry Glanville** (three) and Lemm (three). The Titans won back-to-back AFC South titles in 2020 and 2021, marking the first time the organization accomplished the feat since the Oilers won the first three AFL Eastern division titles from 1960 to 1962.

In each of Vrabel's first five seasons, the Titans had a minimum of a win-and-in scenario to reach the postseason entering the final week of the regular season. The two non-playoff seasons under his leadership came down to such circumstances in 2018 and 2022.

Situationally, Vrabel's teams have fared among the NFL leaders in several categories. From 2018 to 2022, the Titans had a .640 winning percentage in three-point games (16-9), which ranked second in the league

behind only the Green Bay Packers (.658). In the same period, their .855 winning percentage (47-8) in regular season games in which they had a fourth-quarter lead tied for sixth in the NFL. Vrabel's team was 5-2 in overtime games from 2018 through 2022, tying the Kansas City Chiefs (5-0) for the second-most overtime wins behind the Las Vegas Raiders (7-3). On the road, the Titans were 28-18 (.561), tying for the league's sixth-best road record.

From 2018 to 2022, the Titans had the NFL's second-best rushing offense, averaging 139.9 yards per game on the ground. Only the Baltimore Ravens were better (170.8). The offense ranked first in the NFL in the red zone, scoring touchdowns on 66.8 percent of drives inside the opponent's 20-yard line (173 of 259), and the Titans also had the NFL's ninth-best team passer rating at 95.8.

On the other side of the ball, the Titans ranked fourth in rushing defense from 2018 to 2022, allowing 100.2 rushing yards per contest. Also Also in that five-year stretch, the Titans were seventh in scoring defense (21.8 opponent points per game).

During the 2022 season, the Titans led the NFL in total number players used for the second consecutive season. A total of 86 players took the field for at least one game, partly as a result of 31 players being placed on injured reserve from the time the roster was cut to 53 players through the end of the campaign. The Titans relied heavily upon their youth, as rookies combined for 145 games played (tied for third in the NFL) and 56 starts (sixth).

The 2022 Titans led the NFL in rushing defense for the first time as a team since 2003. They allowed only 1,307 total rushing yards for a leaguebest average of 76.9 yards per contest—the second-best finish in franchise history (73.4 in 1960). The Titans also ranked third in third-down defense in 2022, allowing a conversion rate of 34.2 percent (77 of 225).

Vrabel Honored as NFL's Top Coach in 2021

Vrabel was named the Associated Press NFL Coach of the Year in 2021 after directing the Titans to a 12-5 record during the regular season. The Titans won the AFC South, and they claimed the top seed in the AFC playoff field for the first time since 2008. They did so despite needing to use 91 total players during the season—the most in NFL history in a non-strike year. After the final preseason roster cuts through the end of the season, the team placed 26 different players on injured reserve and 21 different players on the reserve/COVID-19 list, plus additional practice squad players that received those designations.

The 2021 Titans ranked second in rushing defense (84.6 yards allowed per game), 12th in total defense (329.8), sixth on third down (36.7 percent), sixth in scoring defense (20.8 points per game) and ninth in sacks (43). Offensively, the Titans finished fifth in rushing (141.4 yards per game) despite missing **Derrick Henry** for nine games due to injury. The offense also ranked eighth on third down (43.6 percent), fifth in the red zone (63.9 percent) and first in goal-to-go efficiency (87.5 percent).

In 2021, Vrabel joined Pardee and Glanville as the only head coaches in team annals to preside over at least three playoff squads in their initial four seasons as head coach, and he tied Pardee (43-26) for the most total wins by a head coach in his first four seasons with the organization.

Titans Take the AFC South in Year 3 Under Vrabel

The Titans won the 2020 AFC South title with an 11-5 record in the regular season, claiming their best record and first division title since going 13-3 in 2008. They finished with a 5-1 record within the division and a 6-2 mark in road games, all while navigating the challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Titans led the NFL in 2020 with a plus-11 turnover differential. Their 23 takeaways ranked seventh in the NFL, while their 12 turnovers were the second-fewest in the league in 2020 and tied for the ninth-lowest number since the NFL went to a 16-game schedule in 1978.

In 2020, the Titans tied for second place in total offense (396.4 yards per game) and ranked fourth in scoring offense (30.7 points per game). They became the first team in NFL history to generate at least 2,500 rushing yards (2,690) and 3,500 net passing yards (3,653) while surrendering 25 or fewer sacks (25). Their 6,343 total yards and 381 first downs established franchise records, while their 491 points amounted to the organization's second-best total.

The 2020 Titans joined the 1997 Detroit Lions as the only teams in NFL history to feature a 2,000-yard rusher, a 3,000-yard passer and a 1,000-yard receiver. Henry led the NFL in rushing for the second consecutive season, and his 2,027 rushing yards gave him the fifth-best total in league history. Meanwhile, **Ryan Tannehill** passed for 3,819 yards, and his 106.5 passer rating was the fifth-best number in the NFL. **A.J. Brown** was named to the

Pro Bowl after recording his second consecutive 1,000-yard season (1,075) and tying for fifth place in the NFL with 11 touchdown catches.

Titans to AFC Championship Game in Vrabel's Second Season

In 2019, Vrabel became the first head coach in the organization's history to win multiple playoff games within his first two seasons. The Titans won a pair of road games—at New England in the wild card round and at Baltimore in the divisional round—to advance to the 2019 AFC championship game, falling at Kansas City to the eventual Super Bowl champion Chiefs.

The Titans began the 2019 campaign with two wins in their first six games but rallied to win seven of their final 10 games in the regular season. From the time the NFL went to its current playoff format in 1990 through 2019, 345 teams went 2-4 or worse in their first six games of a season. From that group, the Titans became only the third team to advance to a conference championship game, joining the 2002 Titans (2-4) and the 1996 Jacksonville Jaguars (2-4).

The 2019 Titans ranked in the NFL's top 10 in scoring margin (eighth, +71), turnover margin (sixth, +6), offensive yards per play (fourth, 6.12), rushing offense (third, 138.9 yards per game), red zone efficiency (first, 75.6 percent), total touchdowns (tied for third, 54) and third-down defense (eighth, 36.3 percent).

In his first season as head coach, Vrabel directed the Titans to a 9-7 record. His nine wins tied for the fourth-highest total in franchise history by a first-year head coach.

With only 82 penalties enforced against the Titans in 2018, Vrabel's team led the NFL and set a franchise record (16-game season) for fewest penalties in a season. The 2018 Titans also placed third in points allowed (18.9 per game), eighth in total defense (333.4 yards per game), sixth in passing defense (216.9), second in red zone defense (44.7 percent touchdown rate) and seventh in rushing offense (126.4) in the league rankings.

Background as a Player and Coach

Vrabel arrived in Tennessee with 18 years of NFL experience, including four seasons as a coach and 14 seasons as a player. His distinguished playing career included three Super Bowl wins (2001, 2003 and 2004), one Pro Bowl selection (2007) and an All-Pro honor (2007). Vrabel played in 206 NFL games and totaled 57 sacks, 496 tackles, 11 interceptions, 20 forced fumbles, nine fumble recoveries and 10 touchdown receptions. Additionally, his teams advanced to the playoffs eight times (20 postseason games), with Vrabel recording eight postseason sacks and two postseason touchdown receptions.

Vrabel joined the Titans after four seasons with the Houston Texans, spending the first three seasons (2014-16) coaching linebackers and one year (2017) as the team's defensive coordinator. During his time in Houston, the Texans built one of the best defenses in the NFL and experienced tremendous success as a team – earning two division titles (2015, 2016).

Between 2014-16, the Texans defense ranked third in the NFL in yards allowed per game (319.9) and net passing yards (218.4). Houston also ranked first in third-down defense (33.6), fourth in opponent completion percentage (59.5) and sixth in points allowed per game (19.8). The 2016 defense ranked number one in the NFL, for the first time in franchise history, in yards allowed (301.3).

In 2017, his first year as a defensive coordinator, the Texans finished the campaign with 19 players on injured reserve. Despite the injuries, Vrabel led the defense to the fifth-best third-down percentage in the NFL and a franchise-record 3.97 yards per carry by opponents. Houston also had 18 different players record at least half a sack last year and 26 players tally at least one tackle for loss.

Vrabel spent his career playing and coaching with accomplished leaders, including **Bill Belichick**, **Bill Cowher**, **Romeo Crennel**, **Urban Meyer**, **Bill O'Brien** and **Todd Haley**.

As the Texans linebackers coach from 2014-16, Vrabel developed several players into top-notch performers, including **Jadeveon Clowney** (Pro Bowl, 2016), **Whitney Mercilus**, **Benardrick McKinney** (second-team All-Pro, 2016) and **Brian Cushing**. The 2015 Texans defense had the top third-down defense in the NFL (28.5 percent), which was the lowest percentage in franchise history and the lowest by any NFL team since the 2003 Titans (27.7 percent). The 2015 defense also set a franchise mark for sacks in a season with 45 - 22.5 coming from Vrabel's linebacking corps.

Prior to joining the NFL coaching ranks, Vrabel transitioned immediately from an NFL player to college coach. He started as the linebacker coach at Ohio State in 2011 and coached the defensive line from 2012–2013. The 2012 Buckeyes finished the season undefeated at 12-0. He also was named Big Ten Recruiter of the Year by ESPN.com in 2012.

Vrabel was selected by the Pittsburgh Steelers in the third round (91st overall) of the 1997 NFL Draft, after his playing career at Ohio State, where he earned All-America honors and Big Ten Conference Defensive Lineman of the Year in both 1995 and 1996.

A native of Akron, Ohio, Vrabel attended Walsh Jesuit High School. He and his wife, Jennifer, have two sons: Tyler and Carter.

MOST WINS IN FRANCHISE HISTORY

In 2022, **Mike Vrabel** passed **Jack Pardee** for the third-highest win total in franchise history among head coaches. He trails only **Jeff Fisher** (147) and **Bum Phillips** (59).

Vrabel is also the sixth head coach in Oilers/Titans history to coach at least three playoff teams. The others are Fisher (six), Pardee (four), Phillips (three), **Jerry Glanville** (three) and **Wally Lemm** (three).

Landry, Simmons and safety Kevin Byard were all named to the Pro Bowl, with Byard adding first-team All-Pro honors.

The Titans defense ranked seventh in the NFL with 23 takeaways, which tied for the most by a Titans defense since 2013 (25). 





Tannehill produced top-five numbers on several other franchise single-season lists in 2020, including 40 total touchdowns (first), 3,819 passing yards (third), 33 touchdown passes (tied for second), 65.5 completion percentage (fourth) and 7.9 yards per attempt (tied for fifth).
- In 2019, Tannehill led the NFL in passer rating (117.5—fourth in NFL history) and passing average (9.6). Tannehill set franchise records in both categories in addition to the team's completion percentage benchmark (70.3).
- In 2018, quarterback Marcus Mariota set a then-franchise record with a 68.9 completion percentage. He also finished with a career-best average of 7.64 yards per attempt and a career-low eight interceptions.
- O'Hara spent 10 years coaching in the Arena Football League, including stints as a head coach for the Los Angeles Avengers (2009), Tri-Cities Fever (AF2, 2009), Orlando Predators (2010-11) and New Orleans Voo-Doo (2012-14).

- In 2022, the Broncos tied for fifth place in the NFL in completions of 25plus yards, trailing only Kansas City (49), Philadelphia (38), Miami (37)

and New England (36). Outten, who called plays for the Broncos in the last two games of the season, helped the offense post 471 total yards of offense in Week 18, which was the most by the team in a single game since Jan. 3, 2016.

- Williams also spent three seasons coaching the defensive line with the Oakland Raiders (2012-14).

NISSAN STADIUM

In 2015, the Titans and Nissan North America announced the formation of a 20-year, exclusive namingrights partnership that rebranded Nashvilla's downtow



rebranded Nashville's downtown stadium as Nissan Stadium.

Nissan Stadium hosts all Titans home football games, Tennessee State University football games, the Music City Bowl, the CMA Music Festival, major concerts and numerous other events.

The procurement of naming rights to Nissan Stadium fit the automotive company's 'Fewer, Bigger, Better' marketing strategy, which has included ongoing sponsorships of NBC's 'The Voice,' the Heisman House college football program and a major advertising presence in this year's Super Bowl. Nissan is also now the official automotive partner of the Tennessee Titans.

Nissan's ever-growing footprint in Tennessee includes vehicle and powertrain manufacturing facilities in Smyrna and Decherd respectively, along with its North American headquarters in Franklin.

The Nissan Smyrna Plant began operations in 1983 and employs more than 8,400 people. In 2014, the Smyrna plant assembled more than 648,000 vehicles, making it the highest volume automotive assembly plant in North America. Nissan also has a major manufacturing presence in Canton, Miss., along with research and development groups in California, Arizona and Michigan. In total, the company employs more than 22,000 employees in the U.S.

One component of the Titans-Nissan partnership is assisting charitable organizations throughout Middle Tennessee in an array of community outreach programs. A centerpiece of this is the annual "Taste of Titans" charitable event, for which Nissan serves as presenting sponsor. During the course of a 20-year relationship, a total of more than \$1 million resulting from these annual events is anticipated to be distributed to local non-profit organizations.

Nissan Stadium is a city-owned venue that has housed the Titans since 1999. The naming rights agreement includes the opportunity for Nissan branding on the exterior of the stadium, as well as stadium signage and other unique displays inside the stadium. LP Building Products held the naming rights to the stadium from 2006 until the Nissan partnership was established in 2015.

MOST PLAYERS FROM 2021-22

In each of the 2021 and 2022 seasons, the Titans led the NFL in the total number of players who played in at least one game. Over that time, the Titans had 137 different players take the field. The next-closest team was the Chicago Bears with 133 total players used.

In 2022, the Titans led the NFL with 86 players who participated in a game, including a league-high 40 players who played on defense and a league-high 74 players who played on special teams. Their 36 different offensive players ranked sixth.

LEAST PENALIZED TEAMS FROM 2018-2022

Under head coach **Mike Vrabel**, who was named to his current post in 2018, the Titans have been one of the NFL's least penalized teams. They have been called for 481 penalties during that time, which ranks 10th in the league.

In 2018, the Titans were called for only 82 penalties, leading the NFL and setting a team record for the lowest number in a 16-game season (since 1978, excluding strike-shortened 1982 and 1987 seasons). They received no more than four penalties in nine of their 16 games. The previous franchise record for fewest penalties in a 16-game season was 84 by the 1983 Oilers.

RED ZONE SUCCESS, 2019–2022

During the past four seasons, the Titans have fielded one of the NFL's most efficient offenses in the red zone. From 2019 to 2022, they had 148 touchdowns in 212 possessions inside their opponent's 20-yard line.

During the 2019 campaign alone, they scored touchdowns on 75.6 percent (34 of 45) of their drives inside the opponent's 20-yard line to lead the league. That was the third-best figure in the NFL since 1991 and the highest since the 2013 Denver Broncos (76.1 percent).

In 2022, the Titans ranked sixth in the NFL with a red-zone efficiency of 64.3 percent. They scored 27 touchdowns on 42 drives inside the 20.

GOAL-TO-GO SINCE 2019

From 2019 through 2022, the Titans were the most efficient NFL team in scoring in goal-to-go situations. Over that time period, they reached the end zone 97 times in 107 total goal-to-go possessions (90.7 percent).

In 2022, they led the NFL in the category for the fourth consecutive season, crossing the goal line 15 times in 16 opportunities for a rate of 93.8 percent.

Since 2000, the Titans own the best two single-season goal-to-go percentages in the NFL. The 2020 squad established the best mark in that period with a 94.1 percentage (32 of 34), followed by their 2022 effort.

20-YARD RECEPTIONS BY ROOKIES

Titans rookies accounted for 18 total receptions of 20-plus yards in 2022. The team's rookie class ranked third in the NFL in 20-yard catches behind only the Pittsburgh Steelers (20) and New Orleans Saints (19).

Wide receiver **TreyIon Burks** led the Titans with eight receptions of at least 20 yards, which tied for sixth place among all NFL rookies. Tight end **Chig Okonkwo** tied for ninth place in the league among rookies with seven such catches. Additionally, wide receiver **Kyle Philips** (two) and running back **Julius Chestnut** (one) contributed receptions of 20-plus yards to the Titans offense.

From 2020 through 2022, the Titans were one of the NFL's most productive rushing offenses. Their 144.5 rushing yards per game ranked fourth in the NFL behind only the Baltimore Ravens (165.4), Cleveland Browns (146.7) and Philadelphia Eagles (145.0).

In 2021, the Titans finished with the fifth-ranked rushing offense (141.4 yards per game). That followed a 2020 campaign in which they ranked second in rushing (168.1).

RUSHING DEFENSE SINCE 2021

Since the beginning of the 2021 season, the Titans have had one of the NFL's stingiest defenses against the run.

In 2022, the Titans led the NFL in rushing defense for the first time since 2003. They allowed only 1,307 total rushing yards in 17 games for a league-best average of 76.9 yards per contest.

In 2021, the Titans placed second in the NFL in rushing defense. Their opponents rushed for an average of 84.6 yards per contest. Only the Baltimore Ravens (84.5) defense allowed fewer yards on the ground.

From 2021 through 2022, the Titans allowed a total of two individual 100-yard rushers—one each season. In 2021, they did not allow a 100-yard individual rushing performance after Jacksonville's **James Robinson** had 149 rushing yards in Week 5 (Oct. 10). In 2022, the New York Giants' **Saquon Barkley** opened the campaign with 164 rushing yards against the Titans, marking the first and only 100-yard game of the season by a Titans opponent.

BEST RUSHING DEFENSES IN TEAM HISTORY

Over the past two seasons, the Titans fielded two of the top rushing defenses in team history. In 2022, their average of only 76.9 opponent rushing yards per game not only led the league but also ranked second in Titans/Oilers annals. Only the 1960 inaugural Oilers squad allowed fewer rushing yards per game (73.4).

The 2021 Titans defense allowed 84.6 rushing yards per game, which now stands as the fifth-best number in Titans/Oilers history.

THIRD-DOWN DEFENSE SINCE 2021

The Titans have fielded one of the NFL's best third-down defenses since the start of the 2021 season.

The Titans placed third in third-down defense in 2022. Opponents converted 77 of 225 attempts for a rate of 34.2 percent. Only the Washington Commanders (31.9) and Denver Broncos (34.1) were better.

They concluded 2021 ranked sixth on third down, allowing opponents to convert on 77 of their 210 chances for a rate of 36.7 percent. Over the final month of the 2021 campaign (Weeks 15-18), the Titans ranked third in the NFL by allowing opponents to convert only 28.6 percent on third down (12 of 42).

Tannehill was named AFC Offensive Player of the Month for December 2019 and was named to his first career Pro Bowl. He also won the Associated Press Comeback Player of the Year Award.

Originally a first-round selection (eighth overall) by the Miami Dolphins in the 2012 NFL Draft, Tannehill was acquired by the Titans in a trade with the Dolphins on March 15, 2019. The Titans sent a 2019 seventh-round pick and a 2020 fourth-round selection to Miami in exchange for Tannehill and a 2019 sixth-rounder.

Over his seven seasons in Miami, he started 88 games, threw for 20,434 yards and 123 touchdowns, and rushed for 1,210 yards and six scores. When he left Miami, he ranked second in franchise history behind **Chad Pennington** in both career completion percentage (62.8) and career passer rating (87.0). He authored 13 game-winning drives for the Dolphins.

From 2012 through 2015, Tannehill's passing yardage total—15,460 yards—was the third highest mark in NFL history for a player's first four seasons, behind only **Peyton Manning** and **Dan Marino**. Tannehill's two 4,000-yard passing seasons (2015 and 2014) were the only ones recorded by a Dolphins quarterback other than Marino (six times). The Dolphins reached the playoffs in 2016, breaking an eight-year postseason drought.

A native of Big Spring, Texas, Tannehill attended Texas A&M, where he earned honorable mention All-America honors as a senior. He played both quarterback and wide receiver, passing for 5,450 yards and 42 touchdowns and adding 112 receptions for 1,596 yards and 10 scores.

Quarterback **Ryan Tannehill** is in his 12th NFL season and his fifth campaign with the Titans in 2023.

During his first four seasons in Tennessee, Tannehill built a 36-19 record as a starting quarterback and led the team to the postseason three times (2019 to 2021), becoming the franchise's

first starting quarterback since **Warren Moon** (1987 to 1993) to direct his team to the playoffs in at least three consecutive seasons. After appearing in the AFC championship game as a wild card team in 2019, the Titans won consecutive division titles in 2020 and 2021, a first for the franchise since the Oilers took the first three AFL Eastern Division titles from 1960 to 1962.

Tannehill's 36 wins as a starting quarterback at the end of the 2022 season ranked fifth in franchise history and were more than any other player in team annals in his first four years with the club. His win total trailed only that of **Steve McNair** (76), Moon (70), **Dan Pastorini** (53) and **George Blanda** (44).

At the conclusion of 2022, Tannehill ranked among the franchise career leaders in several categories: first in passer rating (100.5), first in completion percentage (66.9), sixth in passing yards (12,831), fifth in passing touchdowns (89), sixth in passing attempts (1,623) and sixth in completions (1,085).

Since the week of Tannehill's first start in a Titans uniform (Oct. 20, 2019) through the conclusion of 2022, Tannehill's 100.7 passer rating ranked fourth in the NFL behind only **Aaron Rodgers** (106.0), **Patrick Mahomes** (103.3) and **Jimmy Garoppolo** (100.8).

Tannehill started every game from Week 7 of the 2019 campaign through the sixth game of 2022. His 49 consecutive starts in the regular season broke McNair's record (2001-03) for the most in franchise history by a starting quarterback.

In 2021, he placed third on the franchise's single-season passing charts in attempts (531), completions (357) and completion percentage (67.2), and he ranked fourth with 3,734 passing yards. He became the only quarterback other than Moon (1989–1991) to record multiple seasons with at least 3,500 passing yards with the franchise. Additionally, he rushed for 270 yards, and his seven rushing touchdowns ranked second among NFL signal callers behind **Jalen Hurts'** 10. Tannehill was the first quarterback in franchise annals with at least seven rushing touchdowns in back-to-back seasons.

After receiving a multi-year contract extension during the 2020 offseason, Tannehill responded with 16 starts for the first time since 2015 and produced one of the best seasons of any quarterback in franchise history. A Titans team captain for the first time, his statistics finished in the top five of several of the organization's single-season record lists, including 40 total touchdowns (first), a 106.5 passer rating (second), 3,819 passing yards (third), 33 touchdown passes (tied for second), 65.5 completion percentage (fourth) and 7.9 yards per attempt (tied for fifth). Tannehill became the fourth player in NFL history with a passer rating of at least 106.0 in consecutive seasons, joining **Drew Brees** (2018-20), **Russell Wilson** (2018-19) and Rodgers (2011-12).

Also in 2020, Tannehill and Buffalo's **Josh Allen** became the fourth and fifth quarterbacks in NFL history with at least 3,800 passing yards, 33 passing touchdowns and seven rushing touchdowns in the same season. Only **Cam Newton** (2015), **Daunte Culpepper** (2000) and **Steve Young** (1994) had done so previously.

In 2019, Tannehill set single-season franchise records and led the NFL with a 117.5 passer rating and a passing average of 9.6 yards per



QB WINS, FIRST FOUR SEASONS

In 2022, Titans quarterback **Ryan Tannehill** improved to 36-19 as a starter since he was traded from the Dolphins to the Titans in 2019.

Tannehill is off to arguably the best beginning to any quarterback's tenure in franchise history. He has more regular season wins—36—than any other starting signal caller in franchise history over the player's first four years with the club, surpassing **George Blanda**, who won 34 regular season starts for the Oilers from 1960 to 1963.

Tannehill moved past **Vince Young** (30 wins) for fifth place on the team's all-time wins list for starting quarterbacks. He trails only **Steve McNair** (76), **Warren Moon** (70), **Dan Pastorini** (53) and Blanda (44).

RUSHING EFFICIENCY AMONG QBs

Titans quarterback **Ryan Tannehill's** ability to rush efficiently has reaped benefits since he arrived in Tennessee. From 2019 through 2021, he had 69 first downs on 106 total non-kneel-down rushing attempts, and in that time period, his 65.1 percent conversion rate was the best in the league among signal callers with 50 such attempts.

Tannehill also ranked third in the NFL from 2019 through 2021 with 18 rushing touchdowns. Only **Josh Allen** (23) and **Kyler Murray** (20) had more.

On Dec. 20, 2020, **Ryan Tannehill** recorded a 145.8 passer rating against the Detroit Lions. It qualified as the seventh best single-game passer rating in franchise history (minimum 20 attempts) and was Tannehill's second-highest passer rating in a qualifying game (155.3 vs. Oakland on Sept. 23, 2018).

LEADING VETERAN QBS ON NEW TEAMS

In 2019, **Ryan Tannehill** set a new standard for veteran quarterbacks in their first year with a new team. Tannehill, who was acquired in a trade after seven years with the Miami Dolphins, had a passer rating of 117.5. No quarterback has ever finished with a passer rating that high in his first season with a new team after playing at least one year with another team.

Brett Favre held the distinction until 2019. In 2009, Favre's 107.2 passer rating with the Minnesota Vikings became the best figure in league annals by a veteran in his first campaign with a new club.

GAMES WITH A 130 PASSER RATING

During the 2019 campaign, **Ryan Tannehill** produced a streak of four consecutive games with a passer rating greater than 130. The run included a 133.9 passer rating against the Kansas City Chiefs (Nov. 10), a 155.8 against the Jacksonville Jaguars (Nov. 24), a 131.2 at the Indianapolis Colts (Dec. 1) and a 140.4 at the Oakland Raiders (Dec. 8).

In franchise history, no quarterback prior to Tannehill had ever produced four consecutive starts with a passer rating of 130 or better (minimum 10 attempts per game). **Marcus Mariota** (2016) was the most recent of six Titans/Oilers signal callers to do so for three games before Tannehill.

Tannehill registered a total of six single-game passer ratings of 130 or greater in only 10 starts during the 2019 regular season. He tied Wilson with the most such performances in 2019 and also tied for the most by any NFL starting quarterback in any season since 1960. BAUGH, MONTANA & TANNEHILL

During the 2019 season, Titans quarterback **Ryan Tannehill** accomplished a statistical feat only reached previously by a pair of Pro Football Hall of Fame quarterbacks.

Tannehill's season statistics included a 70.3 completion percentage and an average of 9.6 yards per passing attempt.

In the history of the NFL, only two previous qualifying passers have enjoyed a season in which they completed at least 70.0 percent of their passes and averaged at least 9.0 yards per attempt: **Sammy Baugh** and **Joe Montana**.

Montana led the San Francisco 49ers to a Super Bowl XXIV title and won the NFL MVP award following a 1989 season in which he completed 70.2 percent of his passes (271 of 386) and averaged 9.1 yards per attempt (3,521 yards).

Baugh directed the Washington Redskins to the NFL Championship game in 1945, while completing 70.3 percent of his passes (128 of 182) and averaging 9.2 yards per attempt (1,669 yards).

8 - QB WILL LEVIS 6-4, 229, Rookie, Kentucky

Will Levis was selected by the Titans in the second round (33rd overall) of the 2023 NFL Draft. He was the fourth quarterback chosen in the draft after the Titans traded up in the second round to select him.

He spent two seasons at the University of Kentucky after transferring from Penn State. In four combined college seasons, he appeared in 39

games with 26 starts. He completed 479 of his 738 passes (64.9 percent) for 5,876 yards with 46 touchdowns and 25 interceptions. He also rushed for 742 yards and 17 touchdowns.

➢ At Kentucky, Levis went 17-7 as a starter, tying Terry Wilson for the second-most quarterback wins since 1993. The two-time team captain completed 418 of 636 passes for 5,233 yards with 43 passing touchdowns and 11 rushing scores for the Wildcats. His six 300-yard passing games were the fourth-most in school history.

> As a senior in 2022, he started 11 games at quarterback and connected on 185 of 283 passes for 2,406 yards with 19 passing scores, while ranking fourth in the SEC in pass efficiency (151.9). He finished fifth in the SEC with 19 passing scores.

➢ As a junior in 2021, he transferred from Penn State to Kentucky and started in all 13 games, helping to lead UK to 10 wins for the fourth time in school history. He totaled 3,203 yards total offense, becoming the seventh player in school history to reach 3,000 yards of total offense in a season. He was 233-of-353 passing for 2,826 yards and 24 touchdowns, and he also registered 107 rushes for 376 yards and a team-high tying nine rushing touchdowns.

He is a native of Madison, Conn.

<u>7 - QB MALIK WILLIS</u>

6-1, 219, 2nd Year, Liberty

Malik Willis was selected by the Titans in the third round (86th overall) of the 2022 NFL Draft.

➢ In 2022, he appeared in eight games with three starts as a rookie. He completed 31 of 61 passes for 276 yards with three interceptions and also rushed for 123 yards and a touchdown.

> He was the third quarterback drafted in 2022 after

the Titans traded up four spots in the third round to select him.

> Willis spent three total years at Liberty, including a 2019 redshirt campaign, after transferring from Auburn. In four total seasons, he registered 38 games played with 23 starts, completing 388 of 618 passes for 5,186 yards and 48 touchdowns with 18 interceptions. He also rushed for 2,131 yards and 29 touchdowns on 366 career rushing attempts.

> During his two seasons as Liberty's starting signal caller, he directed the Flames to a 17-6 record in 23 starts, including two bowl victories. During those two seasons he led the FBS with 74 total passing (47) and rushing (27) touchdowns.

> In his final season at Liberty in 2021, Willis led the Flames to an 8-5 record and a bowl win. He completed 207 of 339 passes for 2,857 yards and 27 touchdowns to go along with 197 rushing attempts for 878 yards and 13 touchdowns.

> Willis was named the 2021 Bobby Bowden Trophy winner. The award is presented annually to "a college football player who epitomizes a student-athlete of faith and conducts himself as an exemplary model in the classroom, on the field, on the campus and in the community."

> As a junior in 2020, he started all 10 games in which he played in his first season as Liberty's quarterback after sitting out 2019 due to transfer rules. He won each of his first seven career starts and completed 170 of 265 passes for 2,260 yards, 20 touchdowns and six interceptions during the season. He added 141 rushing attempts for 944 yards and 14 touchdowns, leading all FBS quarterbacks in rushing yards and touchdowns.

He is a native of Atlanta, Ga.

#22 • RB DERRICK HENRY

6-3, 247, 8th Year, Alabama <u>Click for complete bio</u>

Running back **Derrick Henry** is in his eighth NFL season in 2023. He was selected by the Titans with the 45th overall pick in the second round of the 2016 NFL Draft.

2016 NFL Draft. From the time he entered the NFL in 2016 through 2022, Henry rushed for 8,335 yards and 78 yards on 1,750 attempts. No NFL player rushed for more yards or touchdowns than he did during that timespan.



Henry's 78 career rushing touchdowns and 81 total touchdowns (three receiving) at the conclusion of the 2022 campaign were the most in franchise history. He also finished the season third in career rushing yards behind only **Eddie George** (10,009) and **Earl Campbell** (8,574).

Henry tallied 34 100-yard rushing games from 2016 to 2022 (regular season), which ranks fourth in team annals behind Campbell (39), George (36) and **Chris Johnson** (35). Additionally, Henry has authored three career postseason performances with 100-plus rushing yards. Henry's six career 200-yard rushing games are tied with **O.J. Simpson** and **Adrian Peterson** for the most in NFL history, and his six career games with at least 200 rushing yards and at least two rushing touchdowns are the most.

Henry was named to his third Pro Bowl in 2022 after finishing the season with 1,538 yards and 13 touchdowns on 349 rushing attempts (4.4 avg.). He finished second in the NFL in rushing yards behind Las Vegas Raiders tailback **Josh Jacobs** (1,653). His yardage total was the third-best of his career and ranked sixth in franchise history. With a career-high 398 receiving yards, his 1,936 scrimmage yards ranked fifth in franchise history and was the second-best number of his career (2,141 in 2020). His nine 100-yard rushing games ranked fifth in franchise history.

In 2021, Henry's season was affected by a foot injury that caused him to be placed on injured reserve for the final nine games of the regular season. Prior to the injury, he was leading the NFL with 937 rushing yards and 10 rushing touchdowns, numbers that still ranked ninth and tied for sixth, respectively, at the conclusion of the regular season. He returned to start in the team's divisional playoff contest and rushed for 62 yards and one score.

Henry was honored in 2021 with his first career nomination for the NFL's Walter Payton Man of the Year Award.

In 2020, Henry was named the Associated Press NFL Offensive Player of the Year after an historic campaign in which he totaled 378 rushing attempts for 2,027 yards and 17 touchdowns. His rushing yardage total established a new franchise record and led the NFL. As the eighth player in NFL annals to hit the 2,000-yard mark, his 2,027 yards finished fifth on the all-time single-season rushing charts. He was recognized with his second consecutive Pro Bowl, named first-team Associated Press All-Pro, and won the FedEx Ground Player of the Year Award for the second consecutive year.

Henry was a first-time team captain in 2020. He started all 16 regular season games for the first time and became the first player since Tomlinson (2006-07) to lead the NFL in rushing yards in consecutive years. He was the first player in more than 50 years to lead the league in rushing yards, attempts and rushing touchdowns in consecutive seasons and the fifth player ever to do so. The most recent prior to him was Cleveland's **Leroy Kelly** from 1967 to 1968.

Henry's 17 rushing touchdowns in 2020 set a career high and finished

as the second-best total in franchise history behind Campbell's 19 rushing touchdowns in 1979.

In 2019, Henry was named to his first Pro Bowl and added secondteam Associated Press All-Pro honors after leading the NFL in rushing. In 15 games, he totaled 1,540 yards on 303 carries (5.1 avg.), joining **Billy Cannon** (AFL, 1961), Campbell (1978-80) and Johnson (2009) as the only running backs in franchise history to lead their respective leagues in rushing. At the time, Henry's single-season total ranked fourth in franchise annals behind Johnson's 2009 total (2,006) and Campbell's 1979 (1,697) and 1980 (1,934) performances.

With 16 rushing touchdowns in 2019, Henry tied for the NFL lead (**Aaron Jones**). Adding his two receiving touchdowns, his 18 total touchdowns were third in the NFL and tied for second in franchise annals (19 by Campbell in 1979; 18 by **Bill Groman** in 1961).

Henry's performance late in the 2019 season was instrumental in the team's run to the AFC championship game. Over the final six games of the regular season plus three playoff appearances, Henry registered seven 100-yard games. During a three-game stretch (Dec. 29 at Houston, Jan. 4 at New England and Jan. 11 at Baltimore), he became the first player in NFL history to rush for at least 180 yards in three consecutive regular season and/or postseason games.

Henry authored his first career 1,000-yard season in 2018 and the 28th 1,000-yard rushing season in franchise history, totaling 1,059 yards and 12 touchdowns on 215 carries—all then-career highs.

His 2018 rushing yardage ranked second in the AFC to **Joe Mixon's** 1,168 yards, and he finished seventh in the NFL. Henry's 12 rushing touchdowns tied **James Connor** for third place in the NFL behind **Todd Gurley** (17) and **Alvin Kamara** (14).

Henry was named AFC Offensive Player of the Month for December 2018. His 625 rushing yards in the month were the most by any NFL player in any month during the season.

Against the Jacksonville Jaguars on Dec. 6, 2018, Henry recorded one of the greatest single games in franchise history in front of a national primetime television audience. He broke Johnson's single-game franchise record (228) with 238 rushing yards, including a 99-yard touchdown run one of his four touchdowns in the contest. He joined **Tony Dorsett** as the only two players in NFL history to rush for a 99-yard score.

In 2017, Henry shared time in the Titans backfield with **DeMarco Murray**. Henry led the team with 744 rushing yards on 176 carries, and he added 11 receptions for 136 yards and a touchdown. His five rushing touchdowns tied for second on the club.

As a rookie in 2016, Henry played in 15 games with one start, splitting reps in the backfield with Murray. He carried the ball 110 times for 490 yards and five touchdowns and added 137 yards on 13 receptions. Henry became the third rookie for the franchise in the "Titans era" to score at least five touchdowns in a season, joining **Vince Young** (seven rushing touchdowns in 2006) and Johnson (nine rushing and one receiving in 2008).

The Heisman Trophy winner played three seasons (2013–2015) at the University of Alabama, where he set numerous school and SEC records



while helping his team win a National Championship in 2015. He played in 39 games and totaled 602 carries for 3,591 yards and 42 rushing touchdowns and added 285 yards on 17 career receptions with three receiving scores. During Alabama's victory over Clemson in the 2016 College Football Playoff National Championship, he broke **Shaun Alexander's** record for most career rushing yards in Alabama history.

In his final collegiate season, Henry rushed for an Alabama and Southeastern Conference record 2,219 yards, which led the nation and ranked fifth in FBS history. He recorded 100-yard rushing games 10 times and had four 200-yard games during the season. Henry also tied for sixth place in the NFL in 2021 with 10 rushing touchdowns.

2020 NFL RUSHING LEADERS

Titans running back **Derrick Henry** won the NFL's 2020 rushing title with 2,027 yards in 2020, outdistancing the next-closest competitor by 470 yards (1,557 by **Dalvin Cook**).

Henry became the first player to lead the NFL in rushing in consecutive seasons since LaDainian Tomlinson in 2006 and 2007. Since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger, Henry is the eighth different player to lead the league in rushing in back-to-back seasons. The list includes Tomlinson, O.J. Simpson (1972-73, 1975-76), Earl Campbell (1978-80), Eric Dickerson (1983-84), Emmitt Smith (1991-93), Barry Sanders (1996-97) and Edgerrin James (1999–2000).

DERRICK HENRY IN 2020

- Led the NFL and set a franchise record with 2,027 rushing yards in 2020, becoming the <u>eighth player in league annals to rush for at</u> <u>least 2,000 yards in a season</u>. His 2,027 rushing yards gave him the fifth-highest total in NFL history behind **Eric Dickerson's** 2,105 (1984), Adrian Peterson's 2,097 (2012), Jamal Lewis' 2,066 (2003) and **Barry Sanders'** 2,053 (1997). Henry broke Chris Johnson's franchise mark of 2,006 rushing yards in 2009.
- Named the <u>Associated Press NFL Offensive Player of the Year</u> and was named to his second consecutive Pro Bowl. He won his second consecutive FedEx Ground Player of the Year Award and added firstteam AP All-Pro honors. Additionally, he earned first-team All-Pro honors from Pro Football Focus, Pro Football Writers of America and Sporting News and was the 101 Awards AFC Offensive Player of the Year.
- Became the first player since LaDainian Tomlinson (2006-07) to lead the NFL in rushing yards in consecutive seasons. Henry previously led the league in 2019 with 1,540 rushing yards.
- Became the <u>fifth all-time NFL player to lead the NFL in rushing yards, attempts and rushing touchdowns in consecutive seasons</u>. It is a feat that had not been attained since Cleveland's Leroy Kelly did it from 1967 to 1968. The only other players to achieve it are Jim Brown (1958-59), Steve Van Buren (1947-49) and Bill Paschal (1943-44).
- Established a single-game franchise record with 250 rushing yards on Jan. 3 at Houston. He broke his own club record of 238 rushing yards, established against the Jacksonville Jaguars on Dec. 6, 2018. Henry's 250 rushing yards tied for the 13th-best single-game total in the NFL since 1948.
- Became the first player in NFL history with <u>five career games with at least 200 rushing yards and two rushing touchdowns.</u>
- Became the fourth player in NFL history with at least <u>five career 200-yard rushing games</u>, joining **O.J. Simpson** (six), **Adrian Peterson** (six) and **Tiki Barber** (five).
- Set a career high with <u>17 rushing touchdowns in 2020</u>, finishing with the second-best total in franchise history behind **Earl Campbell's** 19 rushing touchdowns in 1979.
- Finished the 2020 season with <u>1.221 rushing yards in road games, the most by any NFL running back since 1948</u>. The previous high was held by **Eric Dickerson**, who had 1,087 rushing yards in road games for the Los Angeles Rams in 1984.
- Dating back to 2019, he had a streak of <u>nine consecutive road games</u> with at least 100 rushing yards, passing **Chris Johnson** (eight games from 2009-10) for the second-longest such streak in NFL history behind only Barry Sanders' 10-game road streak from 1996-97).
- Became the fifth player in NFL history with <u>three 200-yard rushing</u> <u>games in a season</u>, joining **Earl Campbell** (four in 1980), **O.J.** Simpson (1973), Tiki Barber (2005) and Jay Ajayi (2016).
- Became the first NFL player since LaDainian Tomlinson (2002-07) and the ninth player in NFL history to record <u>at least three consecutive</u> seasons in which he rushed for at least 1,000 yards and 12 touchdowns.
- Finished the season with <u>2.141 scrimmage yards</u> (2,027 rushing and 114 receiving), which ranks second in franchise history behind Chris Johnson's 2,509 scrimmage yards in 2009.
- Registered <u>10 games in 2020 with at least 100 rushing yards</u> to tie Earl Campbell (1980) for the third-most in franchise history. Only Campbell in 1979 (11) and Chris Johnson in 2009 (12) had more 100-yard rushing games in a Titans/Oilers season than Henry. Henry's 10 100-yard games in 2020 were the most in the NFL since Dallas running back DeMarco Murray had 12 in 2014.
- Became the NFL's <u>first player to rush for at least 175 and two</u> touchdowns four times in a season.
- Joined Terrell Davis (1997-98), Shaun Alexander (2004-05) and Larry Johnson (2005-06) as the <u>only players in NFL history to rush</u> for 1,500 yards and 15 touchdowns in two consecutive seasons.
- Established a streak of <u>20 consecutive games in the regular season</u> and playoffs with at least <u>18 rushing attempts</u>, the second-longest streak of its kind in the NFL since <u>1948</u>. The only player with more consecutive <u>18-carry</u> games in the regular season and postseason

was **Emmitt Smith**, whose streak was 23 games with the Dallas Cowboys from 1995 to 1996.

- Became the <u>first player in NFL history to produce more than one</u> <u>overtime touchdown run in a season</u>. He joined LaDainian Tomlinson as the NFL's only players with multiple career touchdown runs in overtime. Tomlinson had three during his career.
- Joined Bo Jackson, Ahman Green, Chris Johnson and Lamar Miller as the only NFL players to record two career rushing touchdowns of at least 90 yards. Henry joined Miller (two 97-yard touchdown runs) as the only players to ever record multiple touchdown runs of at least 94 yards.

Derrick Henry won the NFL's rushing title with 303 carries for 1,540 yards and 16 touchdowns in 2019. He followed in 2020 with 378 carries for 2,027 yards and 17 touchdowns.

He became the first player in NFL history to produce multiple seasons with a minimum of 300 rushing attempts, a rushing average of at least 5.0 yards per carry and a minimum of 15 rushing touchdowns

The only other players to do so once in their careers are **O.J. Simpson** (1975), **Terrell Davis** (1998), **Priest Holmes** (2002), **Ahman Green** (2003), **Larry Johnson** (2005), **Shaun Alexander** (2005), **LaDainian Tomlinson** (2016), **Ezekiel Elliott** (2016) and **Dalvin Cook** (2020).

CONSECUTIVE 100-YARD ROAD GAMES

Titans running back **Derrick Henry** recorded 149 rushing yards at Indianapolis on Dec. 1, 2019. Over the course of the next year, he registered at least 100 rushing yards in eight more consecutive regular season road games, increasing his streak to nine games before it ended with a 98-yard effort at Green Bay on Dec. 27, 2020.

In NFL history, Henry's streak is the second-longest continuous stretch of its kind. Detroit's **Barry Sanders** had 10 road games in a row with 100-plus yards from 1996 to 1997.

From the final week of the 2019 regular season (Dec. 29 at Houston) through the Titans' first two playoff games (Jan. 4 at New England and Jan. 11 at Baltimore), **Derrick Henry** became the **first player in NFL history to rush for at least 180 yards in three consecutive regular season or postseason games**.

He also became only the third player since the 1970 NFL-AFL merger to have 200 scrimmage yards in three consecutive games. The other two players to accomplish the feat were Chicago Bears running back **Walter Payton** (1977) and Pittsburgh Steelers running back **Le'Veon Bell** (2014).

During the 2019 regular season and playoffs, Henry and Carolina Panthers running back **Christian McCaffrey** (two) were the only two players with multiple 200-yard scrimmage games. Together they accounted for five of the 14 such individual performances.

DECEMBER TO REMEMBER

In five games in the month of December 2018, **Derrick Henry's** rushing totals included 97 carries for 625 yards and eight touchdowns. His 625 yards were the most by any NFL player in any calendar month in 2018.

Additionally, Henry authored one of only four calendar months for the franchise since 1970 in which a player rushed for at least 600 yards. **Chris Johnson** (800 rushing yards in November 2009) and **Earl Campbell** (633 in October 1980; 662 in November 1980) were the organization's only other players to accomplish the feat in that timespan.

Henry's December rushing totals included 40 yards against the New York Jets (Dec. 2), a franchise-record 238 yards against the Jacksonville Jaguars (Dec. 6), 170 yards at the New York Giants (Dec. 16), 84 yards against the Washington Redskins (Dec. 22) and 93 yards against the Indianapolis Colts (Dec. 30).

For his efforts, Henry was named AFC Offensive Player of the Month.

RECORD-SETTING NIGHT

On Dec. 6, 2018, **Derrick Henry** had one of the most memorable rushing performances in NFL history on Thursday Night Football. He rushed for a then-team-record 238 yards and four touchdowns (tied franchise record), including a 99-yard touchdown run.

Henry's 238 rushing yards set a new franchise record, breaking **Chris Johnson's** mark of 228 yards against the Jaguars on Nov. 1, 2009. It was the highest single-game rushing total in the NFL in 2018 and the league's highest total since **Doug Martin's** 251 rushing yards for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers against the Oakland Raiders on Nov. 4, 2012.

Henry later broke his own record with 250 rushing yard at Houston on Jan. 3, 2021 to take possession of five of the top eight single-game rushing totals in team annals.

In the second quarter, Henry took a handoff from **Marcus Mariota** inside his own one-yard line and raced 99 yards for a touchdown. It was the second 99-yard run in NFL history, tying **Tony Dorsett's** record-setting touchdown run for the Dallas Cowboys against the Minnesota Vikings on Jan. 3, 1983. It was also the team record, topping Johnson's 94-yard touchdown run against the New York Jets on Dec. 17, 2012. The only other runs in franchise history of at least 90 yards were Johnson's 91-yard rush against the Houston Texans on Sept. 20, 2009 and a 91-yarder by Sid Blanks against the Jets on Dec. 13, 1964.

Henry's 99-yard touchdown run tied for the longest scrimmage play in NFL history. It was the 15th such play, including his and Dorsett's runs and 13 passing plays. The last 99-yard scrimmage play before Henry's was New York Giants wide receiver **Victor Cruz's** 99-yard reception from **Eli Manning** against the New York Jets on Dec. 24, 2011.

Henry scored on a three-yard run in the first quarter, a 99-yard run in the second quarter, a 16-yard run in the third quarter, and finally a 54-yard run in the third quarter. He tied the franchise record and became the third player in franchise history to rush for four touchdowns in a game, joining Earl Campbell (against Miami on Nov. 20, 1978) and Lorenzo White (against Cleveland on Dec. 9, 1990).

The only franchise player with more overall touchdowns in a game than Henry was Oilers running back **Billy Cannon**, who had five total touchdowns (three rushing, two receiving) at the New York Titans on Dec. 10, 1961. Henry became the first NFL player with four rushing touchdowns in a game since New England Patriots running back **Jonas Gray** at Indianapolis on Nov. 16, 2014.

- He became the ninth NFL player since 1975 with at least one 90-yard run and at least one 60-yard reception in his career. The others were Tony Dorsett, Garrison Hearst, Tiki Barber, Chris Johnson, Jamaal Charles, Herschel Walker, Warrick Dunn and Adrian Peterson.
- Henry became the seventh NFL player since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger with at least four rushing touchdowns and at least 200 rushing yards in a game, joining Clinton Portis, Barry Sanders, Doug Martin, Jonas Gray, Mike Anderson and Corey Dillon. Henry became the first to accomplish the feat in fewer than 20 carries (17).
- He matched former Titans running back Chris Johnson as the only players in NFL history with a rushing touchdown of at least 90 yards and a rushing touchdown of at least 50 yards in the same game. Johnson accomplished the feat against the Houston Texans on Sept. 20, 2009.
- His 24 points tied for the fourth-highest single-game total in franchise history, trailing only **Billy Cannon** (30 on Dec. 10, 1961), **Rob Bironas** (26 on Oct. 21, 2007) and **George Blanda** (26 on Sept. 18, 1960). **Earl Campbell** (Nov. 20, 1978) and **Lorenzo White** (Dec. 9, 1990) also had 24 points on four touchdowns in a single game.
- His 238 rushing yards and four rushing touchdowns were each the most in any Thursday Night Football game in history.

RUSHING YARDS IN A SINGLE POSTSEASON

Derrick Henry accumulated 446 rushing yards during the 2019 playoffs. He had 182 yards on 34 carries in the wild card round at New England, followed by 195 yards on 30 attempts in the divisional round at Baltimore. In the AFC championship game, he had 69 yards on 19 rushing attempts.

Henry's average of 148.7 rushing yards per game ranked fourth in NFL history for players with at least two games played. Only a trio of Pro Football Hall of Fame members—Denver Broncos running back **Terrell Davis** (156.0 in 1998), Los Angeles Raiders running back **Marcus Allen** (155.3 in 1983) and Washington Redskins running back **John Riggins** (152.5 in 1982) have averaged more rushing yards in a single postseason than Henry.

In Titans/Oilers history, **Eddie George** established the previous record for average rushing yards in a single postseason during the 1999 playoffs. In four games, George carried the ball 108 times for 449 yards, or an average of 112.3 yards per contest.

Henry broke his own record of 191 scrimmage yards in a wild card playoff contest at Kansas City on Jan. 6, 2018 (156 rushing, 35 receiving).

On Jan. 11, 2020, one week after establishing the current record, Henry had 202 scrimmage yards (195 rushing, seven receiving) at Baltimore, giving him the three biggest scrimmage yards totals in franchise postseason history.

Wide receiver **TreyIon Burks** is in his second NFL season in 2023. He was selected by the Titans in the first round (18th overall) of the 2022 NFL Draft.

As a rookie, Burks appeared in 11 games with six starts, totaling 33 receptions for 444 yards and one touchdown. His reception total tied for third place on the team, while his yardage total tied for



third on the squad. Among NFL rookies in 2022, Burks' 444 receiving yards ranked ninth.

In three seasons (2019-21) at the University of Arkansas, Burks appeared in 32 career games with 30 starts. He totaled 146 receptions for 2,399 yards and 18 touchdowns to go along with 32 rushing attempts for 222 yards and one score. He returned 13 punts for 134 yards (10.3-yard average) and returned 11 kickoff returns for 226 yards (20.5 avg.).

At the conclusion of his collegiate career, he ranked sixth in Razorbacks history in career receptions and receiving yards, and his touchdown reception total tied for fifth all-time. He set an Arkansas record with 10 career 100-yard receiving games, including a school-record six 100-yard receiving performances in his final year.

Burks earned All-SEC honors in each of his three seasons: in 2019, second-team All-SEC as a returner and All-Freshman as a receiver; second-team All-SEC in 2020; and first-team All-SEC in 2021.

The Warren, Ark., native was drafted with the highest pick of any Arkansas player since **Darren McFadden** was taken fourth overall in 2008, and Burks was the first Arkansas wide receiver to be selected in the first round since **Matt Jones** was taken 21st overall by Jacksonville in 2006.

As a junior in 2021, Burks was named first-team All-SEC after totaling 66 receptions (seventh in the SEC) for 1,104 yards (fourth) and 11 touchdowns (fourth). His 92.0 receiving yards per game ranked third in the SEC behind only **Jameson Williams** (104.8) and **Wan'Dale Robinson** (102.6).

As a sophomore in 2020, he was named second-team All-SEC after contributing 51 receptions for 820 yards and seven touchdowns. His 91.1 receiving yards per game ranked third in the SEC behind only **Elijah Moore** (149.1) and **DeVonta Smith** (142.8).

Wide receiver DeAndre Hopkins is in his 11th NFL season and his first campaign with the Titans in 2023. He was signed by the team prior to training camp.

Hopkins entered the league as the 27th overall pick in the 2013 NFL Draft out of Clemson and spent his first seven seasons with the Houston Texans before being traded to the Arizona Cardinals in 2020.

In his first 10 seasons, Hopkins established himself as one of the premier receivers in NFL history. During that 10-year period, he ranked first in receptions (853), first in first-down receptions (594), second in receiving yards (11,298), fourth in receiving touchdowns (71), and first in receptions of 25-plus yards (102).

From 2013 through 2022, Hopkins surpassed 100 receptions four times, had six seasons reaching 1,000 receiving yards, recorded three seasons with at least 10 touchdowns, and posted 100 or more receiving yards in a game 40 times.

He has been named to five Pro Bowls (2015, 2017-20) and received AP All-Pro honors four times-first-team All-Pro from 2017 to 2019 and second-team All-Pro in 2020.

Through 2022, he had at least one reception in all 145 career games he played during the regular season. That represents the longest active streak in the NFL at the conclusion of 2022 and the fourth-longest streak in the Super Bowl era to begin a career. Hopkins was the only NFL player to have 100-plus receptions every season between 2018-20.

During the 2022 campaign with the Cardinals, Hopkins finished with a team-high 64 receptions for 717 yards (second on the team) and three touchdowns despite being limited to nine contests. His average of 7.1 receptions per game ranked fourth in the NFL among all players. His three games with 10-plus receptions matched the second most in franchise annals behind Larry Fitzgerald's four such performances in 2017.

At the conclusion of his tenure with the Texans (2013-19), Hopkins owned several franchise records, including franchise marks for career receiving average (13.6), receptions in a season (115 in 2018; tied Andre Johnson, 2008), receiving touchdowns in a season (13 in 2017) and receiving first downs in a season (83 in 2015). When he left Houston, he ranked second on the franchise's all-time career charts in receptions (632), receiving yards (8,602) and touchdown catches (54), trailing only Andre Johnson in each category.

The Central, S.C., native appeared in 39 games with 32 starts over three seasons (2010-12) at Clemson and totaled 206 receptions for 3,020 yards and 27 touchdowns. He left Clemson ranked first in school history in receiving yards, first in receiving touchdowns, first in 100-yard receiving games (12) and second in receptions. As a junior (2012), he led the team with 82 receptions for 1,405 yards and 18 touchdowns.



Wide receiver **Nick Westbrook-Ikhine** is in his fourth NFL season in 2023. He was originally signed by the Titans as a rookie free agent on May 7, 2020.

From the beginning of 2021, his second year in the NFL, through his third year, Westbrook-Ikhine led the Titans in receiving yards (873) and touchdown catches (seven), and his 63 receptions in that time tied for first place.



In 2022, Westbrook-Ikhine appeared in all 17 games with a careerhigh 13 starts. He posted 25 catches for 397 yards and three touchdowns.

In 2021, he played in 16 games with seven starts. He ranked second on the team and set career highs with 38 receptions, 476 receiving yards and four touchdown catches, and he added three tackles on special teams. Westbrook-Ikhine was named the team's 2021 recipient of the Ed Block Courage Award.

The Titans selected Colton Dowell with the 228th overall pick in the seventh round of the 2023 NFL Draft.

During six seasons at Tennessee-Martin, Dowell appeared in 47 games with 34 starts and recorded 177 receptions for 2,796 yards and 19 touchdowns. He established a new UT-Martin record for career receiving yardage and also registered 11 career 100yard receiving performances.

Aaron Brewer is in his fourth NFL season in 2023. He was signed by the Titans as an undrafted free agent on May 7, 2020.



In 2022, Brewer played in every game and started every game for the first time in his career. He started 15 contests at left guard and two games at center, and he helped running back Derrick Henry finish second in the NFL with 1,538 rushing yards.

In 2021, he appeared in 12 games with a career-high five starts, including three starts at right guard and two starts at left guard.

As a rookie in 2020, he appeared in 12 games with one start at left guard (Nov. 22 at Baltimore) before landing on reserve/COVID-19 for the postseason.

The Dallas, Texas, native appeared in 48 games with 47 consecutive starts in four seasons at Texas State. During his college career, he started at least five games at every position on the offensive line. He totaled eight starts at left tackle, seven starts at left guard, 15 starts at center, five starts at right guard and 12 starts at right tackle.

Peter Skoronski was selected by the Titans with the 11th overall pick in the first round of the 2023 NFL Draft.

During a three-year career at Northwestern University, Skoronski started all 33 games at left tackle without missing a game. He earned secondteam All-Big Ten honors as a freshman and first-team



recognition in each of the next two seasons. He became the first offensive lineman in program history to earn two All-Big Ten first-team awards.

While he was a three-year starter at left tackle, he possesses the versatility to move inside to guard.

As a junior in 2022, he was named the Rimington-Pace Big Ten Offensive Lineman of the Year—the first ever by a Northwestern lineman after starting all 12 games at left tackle. He was the first player in school history to become a unanimous first-team All-American and was named first-team All-Big Ten by coaches and media. He finished as a finalist for the 2022 Outland Trophy, recognizing nation's best college interior lineman on both offense and defense.

When the Titans drafted Skoronski, he became Northwestern's highest draft selection since guard **Chris Hinton** went to Denver with the fourth pick in 1983, and he was the 11th player in program history to be picked in the first round.

His grandfather, **Bob Skoronski Sr.**, was a left tackle for the Green Bay Packers, playing nine total seasons with the franchise. > Jaelyn Duncan was selected by the Tennessee Titans in the sixth round (186th overall) of the 2023 NFL Draft.

> In five seasons at Maryland (2018-22), Duncan appeared in 42 games with 39 starts. A four-year starter on the offensive line, he won the starting left tackle position one game into his redshirt freshman campaign and went on to earn All-Big Ten honorable mention three times during his career (2020-22).

> As a senior in 2022, he played and started in 12 games at left tackle. He blocked for a Maryland passing offense that ranked third in the Big Ten in 2022 by averaging 259.8 yards per game through the air. Defensive lineman Denico Autry is in his 10th NFL season and his third season with the Titans in 2023. He was signed by the Titans as an unrestricted free agent on March 19, 2021.

During his first two seasons in Tennessee, Autry appeared in 29 games and led the Titans with 17 total sacks. It was the highest sack total of Autry's career in any two-year period.

Although injuries limited him to 12 games in 2022 (eight starts), he led the defense with eight sacks and a career-high 45 quarterback pressures. He also tallied 27 tackles, eight tackles for loss, four passes defensed, two forced fumbles and a blocked extra point.

Autry has been one of the NFL's best in blocking opponent kicks and punts. From 2014 to 2022, he recorded a league-high total of 10 blocks, including three field goals, six extra points and one punt. He blocked an extra point in 2022.

In 2021, Autry appeared in all 17 games with 11 starts and finished second on the team with nine sacks. His sack total tied his career high, matching the nine sacks he had in 2018 as a member of the Indianapolis Colts. He added 32 tackles, 44 guarterback pressures, 10 tackles for loss and six passes defensed.

After entering the NFL as a rookie free agent with the Oakland Raiders in 2014, Autry played four seasons with the Raiders (2014-17) and then three seasons with the Indianapolis Colts (2018-20). During that time he appeared in 96 games with 56 starts and amassed 200 tackles, 30.5 sacks, 53 quarterback hits, 17 passes defensed, three forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries.

In 2020, Autry collected 33 tackles, 7.5 sacks, 10 guarterback pressures and nine tackles for loss in 14 games with the Colts. His 13 starts were the second-highest total of his career (14 in 2019).

In 2018, Autry led the Colts with a career-best nine sacks in his first season in Indianapolis. He also posted career highs with 13 tackles for loss and two forced fumbles.

The Albemarle, N.C., native played in 26 games (23 starts) in two seasons at Mississippi State University, totaling 73 tackles, 16 tackles for loss, six sacks and three forced fumbles. He spent his first two collegiate seasons at East Mississippi Community College where he was an NJCAA All-American and national champion.

#98 • DT JEFFERY SIMMONS

6-4, 305, 5th Year, Mississippi State <u>Click for complete bio</u>

Defensive lineman **Jeffery Simmons** is in his fifth NFL season in 2023. He was selected by the Titans in the first round (19th overall) of the 2019 NFL Draft.

During his first four seasons, Simmons appeared in 56 games with 54 starts and earned two Pro Bowl berths. The two-time team captain (2021-

22) accumulated 196 tackles, 21 sacks, 19 passes defensed, two forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries. He was second on the defense in sacks during that span behind only **Harold Landry III** (26.5).

In 2022, Simmons appeared in 15 games and anchored a unit that ranked first in the NFL in rushing defense (76.9 opponent rushing yards per game). En route to his second consecutive Pro Bowl appearance, he totaled 53 tackles, 7.5 sacks, 43 quarterback pressures, nine tackles for loss, one forced fumble and a career-high seven passes defensed, which tied for the fourth-best mark among all NFL defensive linemen. Simmons and Arizona's **J.J. Watt** were the NFL's only players in 2022 with at least seven sacks and seven passes defensed.

Before the start of the 2021 season, Simmons was named a team captain for the first time in his career, and he went on to become one of six players on the roster to start all 17 games. He was named to his first career Pro Bowl and added Associated Press second-team All-Pro honors after setting career highs in several categories, including sacks (8.5), tackles (54), quarterback pressures (58), tackles for loss (12) and passes defensed (six). He led the squad in pressures and placed third in sacks. Among all defensive tackles in the NFL, his 8.5 sacks ranked sixth. In the divisional playoffs, he set a franchise postseason record with three sacks.

In 2020, Simmons appeared and started in 15 games. With three defensive fumble recoveries, he tied **Chase Young** for the most in the NFL in 2020 and was the first Titans defender with three fumble recoveries in a season since 2005, when linebacker **Brad Kassell** accomplished the feat. Simmons ranked second on the team with 19 quarterback pressures and added 49 tackles, three sacks, three tackles for loss, five passes defensed and one forced fumble. In the franchise's "Titans era" (since 1999), he became the first player to post at least three fumble recoveries, three sacks and five passes defensed in the same season. He also had three tackles and a tackle for loss in one playoff contest.

Simmons began his rookie season on the non-football injury list due to a knee injury he suffered during training in February 2019. He missed the first six games of the season before joining the 53-man roster in Week 7.



His rookie totals included 40 tackles, two sacks, two tackles for loss, 14 quarterback pressures and one pass defensed in nine games (seven starts). He added four tackles, three quarterback pressures and a fumble recovery in three playoff contests.

During a three-year career as a defensive tackle at Mississippi State, Simmons appeared in 38 contests with 28 starts. He finished his career ranked sixth in school history with 32.5 tackles for loss. He also tied for sixth in MSU annals with five forced fumbles and tied for fourth with three blocked kicks. His totals also included 163 tackles, seven sacks, seven passes defensed and two defensive touchdowns.

He was a first-team All-SEC selection as a sophomore and junior and was one of two players in the nation to be named a Bednarik Award Semifinalist in both 2017 and 2018.

As a junior in 2018, Simmons was named second-team All-American after totaling 63 tackles, 17 tackles for loss and two sacks. His 17 tackles for loss led the team, ranked fourth in the SEC and were the third-most in single-season school history.

During his sophomore season (2017), he set a career high with five sacks and added 12 tackles for loss. With three total blocked kicks and punts, he became the first SEC player since 2004 to lead the nation in the category.

Simmons is a native of Macon, Miss.

Nose tackle **Teair Tart** (first name pronounced "tee-AIR") is in his fourth NFL season in 2023. He joined the Titans as a rookie free agent following the 2020 NFL Draft.

Tart ascended in his first three seasons from an undrafted rookie with one start in 2020 to 16 starts in 2022. His statistics during his first three campaigns

included 55 tackles, 1.5 sacks, one interception and six passes defensed.

In 2022, Tart's 16 starts at nose tackle established a career high. He also established career-best totals with 34 tackles, 1.5 sacks, 22 quarterback pressures, five tackles for loss, one interception, six passes defensed and one fumble recovery. He helped the Titans finish with the NFL's top rushing defense (76.9 opponent rushing yards per game).

In 2021, he appeared in 11 games with 10 starts. His totals included 16 tackles, three quarterback pressures and two tackles for loss, giving him career highs in each category.

In 2020, he appeared in seven games as a rookie and totaled five tackles, two quarterback pressures, one tackle for loss, one pass defensed.

The Philadelphia, Pa., native appeared in 23 games with 10 starts over two seasons at Florida International, totaling 51 tackles, 19.0 tackles for loss, six sacks, one pass defensed, five quarterback pressures and two forced fumbles.

Tart also played at Ellsworth (Iowa) Community College in 2017 and ASA (N.Y.) College in 2016.

> Naquan Jones was signed by the Titans as an undrafted free agent on May 14, 2021.

In 2022, he appeared in 11 games with one start and totaled 16 tackles, a sack, three quarterback pressures and two stops for loss.

In 2021, he appeared in 13 games as a rookie and registered five starts. He totaled 29 tackles, 2.5 sacks, four quarterback pressures, four tackles for

loss and two passes defensed. He also started the team's divisional playoff contest and totaled two tackles and a half sack.

Linebacker **Azeez Al-Shaair** (name pronounced "uh-ZEEZ al-SHY-er") is in his fifth NFL season and his first campaign with the Titans in 2023. He was signed as an unrestricted free agent on March 20, 2023.

Prior to joining the Titans, Al-Shaair played 56

games with 31 starts in four seasons (2019-22) with the San Francisco 49ers. He totaled 199 tackles, two sacks, 11 tackles for loss, two interceptions, seven passes defensed, two forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries.

In 2022, he appeared in 12 games with nine starts. San Francisco boasted the league's top-ranked defense, allowing only 300.6 yards and 16.2 points per game, both of which led the NFL.

In 2021, he set career marks with 13 starts, 103 tackles, two fumble recoveries and two sacks. He matched career highs with one interception and one forced fumble.

The Tampa, Fla., native entered the NFL in 2019 as undrafted college free agent from Florida Atlantic. During college, he was a four-year starter and recorded 397 tackles, 32.5 tackles for loss, 7.5 sacks, two forced fumbles and one interception. He earned all-conference honors following his junior season.

> Luke Gifford was signed by the Titans as an unrestricted free agent on March 20, 2023.

➢ Gifford joined the Titans after playing four years (2019-22) with the Dallas Cowboys as a standout special teams player. He totaled 40 tackles on defense and 30 special teams stops in 46 games.

 \succ In 2022, he led the Cowboys with 12 special teams tackles and forced a fumble.



 \succ In both 2021 and 2020, he was second on the team in special teams tackles with a combined 12 stops and a blocked punt.

➢ He played four seasons at Nebraska (2015-18), appearing in 29 games with 19 starts and totaling 109 tackles, seven sacks, 19 tackles for loss and three interceptions.

> Otis Reese IV was signed by the Titans as a rookie free agent on May 12, 2023.

➢ In three seasons at Mississippi (2020-22), he played in 29 games with 27 starts and recorded 198 tackles, 10 tackles for loss, 4.5 sacks, two interceptions, eight passes defensed, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery.



> As a graduate in 2022, he started all 11 games

and finished second on the team with 84 total tackles, including eight tackles for loss. He added three sacks, one interception, one fumble recovery and four passes defensed.

In 2022, Rice played in 13 games with six starts and ranked fourth on the team with 63 tackles. He added three quarterback pressures, four stops for loss, a pass defensed and three special teams stops.
 In 2021, he appeared in 10 games with four starts before finishing the season on injured reserve. He registered 30 tackles and one pass defensed.

> The Huntsville, Ala., native played four seasons at Georgia (2017-20) where he appeared in 47 games with 28 starts and tallied 219 tackles, 10.5 tackles for loss, two sacks, 21 quarterback pressures, five passes defensed, three forced fumbles and one fumble recovery returned for a touchdown for the Bulldogs.

➢ In 2020, Rice was named a finalist for the Butkus Award, which recognizes the nation's best linebacker, after amassing 49 tackles, four tackles for loss, one sack, one pass defensed, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery returned for a score.

 \succ As a junior in 2019, Rice was Georgia's leading tackler with 89 total stops.

> In 2018, he played in nine games and made five starts. Finished as Georgia's third-leading tackler with 59 stops. Also posted 1.5 tackles for loss, one sack, two quarterback pressures, one pass defensed and one forced fumble.

6-5, 240, 6th Year/1st with Titans, Louisiana State Click for complete bio

Outside linebacker **Arden Key** is in his sixth NFL season and his first campaign with the Titans in 2023. He was signed by the Titans as an unrestricted free agent on March 20, 2023.

Key originally entered the NFL as a thirdround pick (87th overall) of the Oakland Raiders in 2018 and spent his first three campaigns with the

organization. He then spent the 2021 campaign with the San Francisco 49ers and the 2022 season with the Jacksonville Jaguars. His statistical totals during his first five NFL seasons included 98 tackles and 14 sacks in 71 games (13 starts).

In 2022, Key played 17 games with three starts for the Jaguars and totaled 27 tackles, 4.5 sacks, 38 quarterback pressures, five tackles for loss and a fumble recovery. His 38 pressures ranked second for the Jaguars, and over the last five weeks of the season, he posted 25 pressures, which ranked second in the league behind Nick Bosa over that time frame. He was a key figure in helping the Jaguars win the AFC South and advance to the divisional round of the playoffs.

In 2021, Key notched a career-best 6.5 sacks to go along with 22 tackles and 25 quarterback pressures in his lone season with the 49ers.

During a three-year career at Louisiana State University, Key totaled 21 sacks and 26.5 tackles for loss. As a sophomore, he earned all-conference honors, while setting the school record for sacks in a season (12.0). He is a native of Atlanta, Ga.

#58 • OLB HAROLD LANDRY III

6-2, 252, 6th Year, Boston College <u>Click for complete bio</u>

Outside linebacker **Harold Landry III** is in his sixth NFL season in 2023. He was selected by the Titans in the second round (41st overall) of the 2018 NFL Draft after the Titans traded up 16 spots in the second round (57 to 41) in order to take the former Boston College standout.

Landry was placed on injured reserve on Sept.

2, 2022, ending his fifth NFL season before Week 1.

From the start of his rookie campaign through 2021, Landry's 31 total sacks led the Titans. Other than **Jevon Kearse** (37), Landry produced the highest sack total by a Titans/Oilers player in his first four NFL seasons since individual sacks became an official NFL statistic in 1982.

From 2018 to 2021, Landry joined Pittsburgh's **Cameron Heyward** as the NFL's only players to be credited with at least 250 tackles (press box statistics), 30 sacks and two interceptions.

In 2021, Landry was named to his first Pro Bowl after starting all 17 games. He registered his third consecutive season to start every contest, extending his streaks to 64 consecutive games played and 52 consecutive starts. At the conclusion of 2021, his starting streak was the sixth-longest active streak in the NFL among all defensive players.

Landry's 12 sacks in 2021 led the Titans, ranked 10th in the NFL and established a career high. He became the first Titans player to record double-digit sacks in a season since **Brian Orakpo** (10.5) in 2016 and the first Titans player with 12 sacks in a season since **Jason Babin** (12.5) in 2010. Landry tied for second on the squad with 75 tackles, ranked second with a career-high 49 quarterback pressures, led the team with 14 tackles for loss, and added a forced fumble. He joined **Micah Parsons**, **Aaron Donald** and Heyward as the only NFL players in 2021 to post at least 75 tackles and 10 sacks.

Then, in the team's 2021 divisional playoff contest, he recorded 1.5 sacks. He improved his postseason career total to 4.5 sacks, becoming the organization's first player with at least four career postseason sacks since individual sacks became an official statistic in 1982.

In 2020, Landry recorded 16 starts for the second consecutive season. He led the team with 5.5 sacks, a then-career-high 32 quarterback pressures and a then-career-high 10 tackles for loss. He totaled 69 tackles and added one interception and a career-high five passes defensed. In one playoff contest, he led the team with 10 tackles and two sacks.

Landry started all 16 games in 2019 and led the Titans with nine sacks. His 28 quarterback pressures ranked second, and he added 81 tackles, four tackles for loss, one pass defensed, one forced fumble and two fumble recoveries. He also started all three postseason games and registered a sack and a team-high eight quarterback pressures.

As a rookie in 2018, he played in 15 games with three starts. His 4.5 sacks tied for third place on the team, and he also tied for second on the



defense with 18 quarterback pressures.

In 46 career games playing defensive end for Boston College, Landry totaled 160 tackles, 26 sacks, 47.5 tackles for loss, seven passes defensed, 10 forced fumbles, one fumble recovery and one interception. His 26 career sacks were exceeded in school history by only **Mathias Kiwanuka** (37.5 from 2002-05).

As a senior in 2017, Landry played and started eight games before a season-ending ankle injury ended his year. He finished second on the team with five sacks and totaled 38 tackles, 8.5 tackles for loss and two passes defensed.

In 2016, Landry set the school's single-season record with 16.5 sacks, which led the nation. He added seven forced fumbles, which also led the country, while his 22 tackles for loss ranked fifth nationally and ranked second all-time for the Eagles. His numerous honors included Walter Camp second-team All-America, AP second-team All-America and second-team All-ACC by the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association and the league's head coaches.

He is a native of Spring Lake, N.C.

When Harold Landry III registered a sack against the New Orleans Saints on Nov. 14, he joined Jevon Kearse as the only Titans/Oilers players since individual sacks became an official NFL statistic in 1982 to produce at least a half sack in eight consecutive games. Kearse had a half sack or more in each of the final 10 games of his 1999 NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year campaign and in the first two games of his second season.

In 2019, Landry recorded five consecutive games with at least a half sack.

Trevis Gipson was signed by the Titans as a free agent on Aug. 31, 2023.

Cornerback **Kristian Fulton** is in his fourth NFL season in 2023. He was selected by the Titans in the second round (61st overall) of the 2020 NFL Draft.

In 2022, Fulton appeared and started in 11 games and established a career high with 48 tackles. He added one interception, five passes defensed, three tackles for loss, one forced fumble and one



fumble recovery. His five passes defensed gave him 20 for his career, which ranked second on the team from 2020 to 2022 behind only **Kevin Byard** (26).

In 2021, Fulton became a mainstay in the Titans lineup, starting all 13 games in which he played. He contributed two interceptions and tied for 11th in the NFL with a team-high 14 passes defensed. Among all players in their first two NFL seasons, his 14 passes defensed in 2021 tied for the league's fourth-highest total. 

With 27 career interceptions at the end of the 2022 season, Byard tied for the fourth-highest total in franchise history and the most for the franchise in its "Titans era," which began in 1999. Only former Oilers Jim Norton (45), Cris Dishman (31) and Fred Glick (30) have totaled more interceptions than Byard, who tied Tony Banfield, W.K. Hicks and Darryll Lewis with 27.

Over a six-year period from 2017 through 2022, Byard's 27 interceptions led all NFL safeties. The only player with more interceptions in that time was Miami Dolphins cornerback Xavien Howard, who had 28.

Byard did not miss a game from 2016 through 2022, totaling 114 games in the regular season and seven postseason games. At the conclusion of 2022, his 105 consecutive starts in the regular season was the leading current streak among all Titans players and trailed only New England's Devin McCourty (115) among all NFL defenders.

In 2022, Byard led the Titans with four interceptions and 106 tackles. It was his fifth total season (2017-19, 2021-22) and second consecutive season in which he led the squad in interceptions, and it was his third straight campaign (2020-22) leading the defense in tackles. Prior to 2021, no previous Titans/Oilers player had led the team in both interceptions and tackles in a single season, and Byard accomplished the feat in consecutive seasons from 2021 to 2022.

In 2021, Byard was announced as a starter to his second career Pro Bowl and earned first-team Associated Press All-Pro honors for the second time in his career. He joined Bruce Matthews (1999-2000) and Albert Haynesworth (2007-2008) as the franchise's only players in its Titans era to earn multiple first-team AP All-Pro honors.

Byard led the Titans in 2021 with five interceptions and 88 tackles, becoming the franchise's first player to lead the team in tackles and interceptions in the same season since the team began tracking individual tackle statistics in 1974. It was his second consecutive season to lead the club in tackles and the fourth time in his career he was the interceptions leader. Additionally, his 13 passes defensed ranked second on the team and made up the highest total among NFL safeties. He also was credited with one sack, two quarterback pressures, one tackle for loss, two forced fumbles, one fumble recovery and his first two career touchdowns-one on a fumble return and one on an interception return. He was the first Titans player with two defensive touchdowns in the same season since linebacker Zach Brown in 2012.

In 2020, Byard was a defensive team captain for the second consecutive season and the team's Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year nominee. His 111 tackles led the team and established a career high. Additionally, he registered one interception, seven passes defensed, two quarterback pressures, one tackle for loss and one forced fumble. In one playoff game he produced five tackles, one pass defensed and a quarterback pressure. Byard's 2019 totals included a team-leading five interceptions, 10

passes defensed, 91 tackles, one quarterback pressure and two tackles for loss. In three postseason games, he added 20 tackles and one interception. In 2018, Byard finished with a team-leading four interceptions, 10

passes defensed. 96 tackles and two sacks. He also completed a touchdown pass on a memorable fake punt to help defeat the Houston Texans (Sept. 16).

Byard experienced a breakthrough second-year season in 2017. He was named to the Pro Bowl and earned first-team Associated Press All-Pro honors after tying Detroit's Darius Slay for the NFL lead with eight interceptions. He added a pair of fumble recoveries to pace the league with 10 total takeaways.

As a rookie in 2016, Byard played in every game, starting the final seven contests at free safety. His 63 tackles were the most by a Titans rookie safety since Tank Williams' 69 tackles in 2002. He also ranked second on the squad with 10 special teams tackles.

During a four-year career at Middle Tennessee State University, he appeared in 49 games and notched 46 starts at safety while becoming one of the most prolific defenders in school history. He set school records with 19 career interceptions, 377 interception return yards and four interception returns for touchdowns, and he finished sixth in MTSU history with 312 career tackles. In total, he had a hand in 25 turnovers (19 interceptions, five forced fumbles and one fumble recovery) during his career and added 17 career passes defensed and five tackles for loss. He was twice named first-team All-Conference USA.

As a senior in 2015, Byard appeared in 12 games with nine starts as a permanent team captain and was named first-team All-Conference USA for the second consecutive year. He ranked fourth on the team with 66 tackles and led the squad with four interceptions and six additional pass breakups.

The Lithonia, Ga., native set a career high in college with six interceptions as a junior and forced to fumbles the same season.

INTERCEPTIONS IN A GAME, TEAM HISTORY

With three interceptions at Cleveland on Oct. 22, 2017, safety **Kevin Byard** tied a franchise record and became the ninth player in franchise history to record three interceptions in a regular season game.

Byard became the first NFL player in 2017 to record three interceptions in a game and the first NFL player to do so since Philadelphia Eagles safety **Kurt Coleman** at Washington on Oct. 16, 2011. He was the first Titans player to record three interceptions in a game since linebacker **Keith Bulluck** accomplished the feat at New Orleans on Monday night, Sept. 24, 2007.

PLAYERS WITH INTERCEPTION & TD PASS

In a victory over the Houston Texans on Sept. 16, 2018, Kevin Byard completed a 66-yard touchdown pass to defensive back Dane Cruikshank.

Byard became the first defensive player in franchise history to record a touchdown pass. Additionally, Byard's touchdown pass was the longest by a defensive player in the Super Bowl era. The previous long was held by Los Angeles Rams defensive back **Ed Meador**, who had an 18-yard touchdown pass at Atlanta on Nov. 19, 1967.

Byard, who tied for the NFL lead in 2017 with eight interceptions, also became only the fifth player in the Super Bowl era to throw at least one touchdown pass and record at least one career interception.

Safety **Amani Hooker** is in his fifth NFL season in 2023. He was selected by the Titans in the fourth round (116th overall) of the 2019 NFL Draft.

In 2022, Hooker was limited to nine games due to injuries. He contributed 46 tackles, one interception, three passes defensed, one forced fumble, one fumble recovery, four quarterback pressures and one tackle for loss.



Hooker appeared in 12 games in 2021 with a career-high 12 starts. He totaled a career-best 62 tackles, one tackle for loss, one interception, four passes defensed and one forced fumble. He added seven tackles and an interception in the team's divisional playoff contest.

Defensive back **Elijah Molden** is in his third NFL season in 2023. He was selected by the Titans in the third round (100th overall) of the 2021 NFL Draft.



In 2022, Molden was limited by injuries to two games and one start. He totaled five tackles, one quarterback pressure and one tackle for loss before his second stint on injured reserve ended his season.

As a rookie in 2021, Molden appeared in 16 games with seven starts. He ranked fifth on the team and first among Titans rookies with 60 tackles and registered one interception for a touchdown. He was one of six rookie defensive backs with at least 60 tackles and one interception. Additionally, he contributed six quarterback pressures, three tackles for loss, four passes defensed, one forced fumble, one fumble recovery and two stops on special teams. In the team's divisional playoff contest, he started and registered two tackles.

Prior to arriving in Tennessee, Molden totaled 153 tackles, five interceptions, 25 passes defensed, four forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries in 44 games at the University of Washington. 

Long snapper **Morgan Cox** is in his 14th NFL season and his third campaign with the Titans in 2023. He was signed by the Titans as an unrestricted free agent on March 19, 2021.



more Pro Bowl appearances than any other player at his position since the league began naming long snappers to the Pro Bowl in 2004.

His steady play in 2022 helped rookie punter **Ryan Stonehouse** lead the league and set a new NFL record with a 53.1-yard gross punting average. Stonehouse also finished fourth in the NFL and set a rookie record with a 44.0-yard net average. Meanwhile, kicker **Randy Bullock** made 17 of 20 field goals (85.0 percent) and made all 28 extra point attempts.

In 2021, Cox handled all of the team's long snapping duties in 17 regular season games and one postseason game. He helped Bullock finish ninth in franchise history with 120 points in a single season, including three game-winning field goals (Sept. 19 at Seattle, Oct. 31 at Indianapolis and Dec. 23 against San Francisco). He also snapped for punter **Brett Kern**, who had the league's third-best ratio of punts inside the 20 to touchbacks (18:1).

In his first 11 seasons, Cox appeared in 165 regular season games for the Baltimore Ravens, serving as the team's primary long snapper after entering the NFL as an undrafted free agent in 2010. He was selected to four Pro Bowls and was a part of five playoff teams in Baltimore, totaling 10 postseason games played.

In 2020, he earned his fourth career Pro Bowl selection. He helped kicker Justin Tucker record his fifth consecutive season with at least 130 points, tying the NFL record of consecutive seasons with 130-plus points. Tucker connected on 26 of 29 field goals (89.7 percent) and was 52 of 53 on extra points (98.1 percent). Cox also snapped on all 51 of **Sam Koch's** 51 punts, as Koch was the NFL's only punter to place at least 20 punts (22) inside in the 20-yard line and have no more than one touchback.

A native of Collierville, Tenn., Cox played 38 games in three seasons (2007-09) as the primary long snapper at the University of Tennessee.

Kicker **Nick Folk** is in his 16th NFL season and his first campaign with the Titans in 2023. He was acquired by the Titans in a trade with the New England Patriots on Aug. 29, 2023.



In his first 15 NFL seasons, Folk appeared in 211 games during his time with the Dallas Cowboys (2007-09), New York Jets (2010-2016), Tampa Bay

Buccaneers (2017) and Patriots (2019-22). During that time, he connected on 82.9 percent (353 of 426) of his field goal attempts and 96.8 percent of his extra point attempts (458 of 473). He had 10 seasons with at least 100 points, including a league-leading 150 points in 2021 with the Patriots. He registered 11 game-winning field goals in the regular season and one in postseason play.

Folk ended the 2022 campaign with an active streak of 60 straight field goals made under 40 yards—every attempt in the regular season since his last miss on Oct. 5, 2017 against New England as a member of the Buccaneers. Through 2022, the NFL record was 70 by **Justin Tucker** of Baltimore (2016-20).

Over his four years with New England, Folk made 108 of his 121 field goal attempts (89.3 percent) in 57 games. He departed the Patriots in fifth place on the New England all-time field goal list and tied for seventh place on the franchise's all-time scoring list with 440 total points.

In 2022, he played in all 17 games for New England and totaled 128 points on 32-of-37 field goal attempts. He was also 32-of-35 on extra points. Folk became one of six all-time NFL players to have at least five seasons with 30 field goals, joining **Justin Tucker** (eight), **Stephen Gostkowski** (five), **Robbie Gould** (five), **John Carney** (five) and **David Akers** (five).

Folk established the NFL record for consecutive field goals made under 50 yards with a streak of 64 such kicks from Oct. 5, 2017 to Oct. 16, 2022. He broke the record (56 consecutive) set by **Ryan Succop** of the Titans from 2014 to 2017.

While with the Patriots, he also set the franchise mark for consecutive field goals made (36) during a streak that spanned from 2020 to 2021 and posted the third-highest field goal percentage for a season by a Patriot in 2020 (92.9).

Folk entered the NFL as a sixth-round selection by the Dallas in the 2007 NFL Draft. As a rookie for the Cowboys, he earned a Pro Bowl selection and all-rookie honors.

A native of Sherman Oaks, Calif., Folk attended the University of Arizona, where he earned All-PAC 10 accolades in his final season.

Punter Ryan Stonehouse is in his second NFL season in 2023. He was signed by the Titans as a rookie free agent on May 13, 2022.

In 2022, Stonehouse finished the season with a gross average of 53.10 yards per punt on 90 total punts (4,779 total yards). In doing so, he broke Sammy Baugh's single-season NFL record of 51.40

yards per punt, which was established in 1940 and was never matched among qualifiers (2.5 punts per team game) until Stonehouse's rookie campaign. Stonehouse's mark also surpassed Brett Kern's franchise record of 49.7 yards per punt in 2017.

With a net punting average of 44.03 yards per punt in 2022, Stonehouse also established a new NFL record for the highest net average by a rookie punter. He broke the record set by Indianapolis' Rigoberto Sanchez, who averaged 42.64 net yards per punt as a rookie in 2017. Stonehouse finished fourth in the NFL in net punting behind veterans Tommy Townsend (45.6), Michael Dickson (44.5) and Johnny Hekker (44.1). In franchise history, his net average ranked second for a single season, trailing only Kern's 44.6 net average in 2017.

Stonehouse's 90 punts in 2022 made up the NFL's second-highest total. Only Denver's Corliss Waitman (96) had more. The 90 punts by Stonehouse tied Craig Hentrich's 1999 number for the fourth-highest total in team annals behind Rich Camarillo (96 punts in 1994) and Cliff Parsley (93 in 1979; 91 in 1978).

Stonehouse appeared in 53 games over five seasons at Colorado State

(2017-21) and set an NCAA career record with a 47.8-yard gross punting average. His career totals included 244 punts for 11,656 yards with 91 punts inside the 20. He totaled 106 punts of 50-plus yards and became the first player in Colorado State history to log 11,000 punting yards in a career.

During his final college season in 2021, Stonehouse appeared in 12 games and averaged 50.9 yards per attempt on 58 punts, including a careerlong 81-yard punt. He placed 27 punts inside the 20-yard line and totaled 32 punts of 50-plus yards en route to being named a second-team All-Mountain West selection and a Ray Guy Award semifinalist.

He is a native of La Verne, Calif.

NFL RECORD: SINGLE-SEASON AVERAGE

In 1940, Washington's Sammy Baugh punted 35 times for 1,799 yards, averaging 51.40 yards per punt. Eighty-two seasons later, the mark still stood as the best qualifying single-season punting average in NFL history, until Titans rookie punter Ryan Stonehouse broke the record in 2022.

Stonehouse, an undrafted rookie from Colorado State University, averaged 53.10 yards per attempt on 90 total punts-1.70 yards per punt ahead of Baugh's number.

Prior to Stonehouse's rookie campaign, Baugh's mark was one of the NFL's longest-held records. In the 2022 NFL Record & Fact Book, only three single-season individual records predated Baugh's punting mark, and all three of those were later tied: most safeties in a season (two by Green Bay's Tom Nash in 1932 and subsequently tied 18 times), most fumbles returned for a touchdown in a season (two by Boston's Harold McPhail in 1934 and tied 44 times), and most opponent fumbles returned for a touchdown in a season (two by McPhail in 1934 and tied 41 times).

To qualify for the single-season average record, a punter needs a minimum of 2.5 attempts per team game.

FROM AIRPORT TO NISSAN STADIUM (APPROXIMATELY 15 MINUTES): Take I-40 West toward Nashville/Memphis to I-24 West (before downtown). Exit at James Robertson Parkway (Exit 48). Turn left at first light (Interstate Drive). Turn right on Woodland Street. Nissan Stadium will be on the left. Follow signs to parking lot ("M" lot on northwest corner/river side of stadium).

NISSAN STADIUM MEDIA WILL CALL/MEDIA ENTRANCE

The media will call window and media entrance are located in the northwest corner of Nissan Stadium near Gate 6. The media will call window opens three hours prior to kickoff.

FIELD MEDIA VESTS

All members of the media with field access during the game must wear a media vest. Still and video photographers will be issued tan vests, while team-affiliated photographers and videographers (scoreboard, social, coaches' shows, etc.) will be issued gray vests. Additionally, media with in-game field access will be issued armband. All vests and armbands must be obtained prior to each game at the check-in table. **Vest check-in is located on the third-floor landing near the press box.** All vests must be returned at the conclusion of the game to Titans personnel or to the vest check-in table.

NISSAN STADIUM PRESS BOX INTERNET ACCESS

Wireless internet access is available free of charge in the Nissan Stadium press box. The login information will be available upon arrival in the press box. A limited number of ethernet lines also are available. Accessing the wireless network works the same in the Nissan Stadium press box as it does in most areas with free connectivity. Titans staff may be able to assist in a limited manner, but you should first contact your company's I.T. department with any questions.

FROM NISSAN STADIUM PRESS BOX TO INTERVIEW ROOMS

Take the press box elevator (Level 3) to field level (Level 1). The Titans interview room is immediately on the right. Turn left and continue straight along the concourse to reach the visiting team's interview room (white line).

POSTGAME POLICIES

Reporters with press box credentials will not be allowed on the field during pre-game activities or during the game itself. Press box credentials do NOT provide access to the field at the two-minute warning in the fourth quarter. Media will be allowed to gather in the Titans interview room to watch the end of the game or remain in the press box to make the short walk down to the field level at the conclusion of the game. Interviews with Titans players are not permitted on the field following the game. The press conference will begin approximately 10 minutes following the conclusion of the game and will be held in the interview room across from the Titans locker room. Key players also will be brought to the interview room. Simultaneously, the locker room will open to credentialed media members with a working function. The press conference audio will be played live over the press box speakers.

POSTGAME QUOTES

Quotes from each team's head coach and key players will be transcribed and distributed throughout the Nissan Stadium press box following the game. The quotes also will be available at www.TennesseeTitans.com/media.

POOL REPORTS

Pool reporters are assigned by the Pro Football Writers of America. Requests for pool reports with game officials must be made in advance through the home team's media relations. Interviews will be conducted virtually. Pool reports will be recorded, transcribed and then distributed in the press box.


