THE MATCHUP

After knocking off the Carolina Panthers 17-7 in Week Ten to snap a four-game losing streak, the New Orleans Saints enjoyed some much-needed rest last week.

In the important division win over Carolina, QB **Tyler Shough** threw for 282 yards, the most all-time by a Saints rookie signal-caller, also adding two touchdowns and avoided turnovers to post a 128.9 passer rating, as New Orleans improved to 2-8 overall and evened their division record at 1-1.

New Orleans withstood an early touchdown by the Panthers to hold them scoreless for the remainder of the contest. In keeping the Panthers off the scoreboard for the last 52:01, the New Orleans defense set season-bests in points allowed [seven], fewest touchdowns allowed [one], fewest net yards allowed [175], fewest net yards passing allowed [102], fewest first downs allowed [13] and passing first downs allowed [six], while tying the season-low for rushing yards allowed [73] and rushing first-downs allowed [five].

Individually on defense, sacks were recorded by DE **Cameron Jordan** and DT **Nathan Shepherd**, with Shepherd adding a blocked field goal to garner NFC Special Teams Player of the Week. LB **Demario Davis** led the team with seven tackles, while CB **Alontae Taylor** had a fourth quarter interception.

New Orleans won the battle of time of possession 33:21-26:39, powered by 83 rushing yards and 32 receiving yards by RB Alvin Kamara. In the passing game, it was a big day for WR **Chris Olave**, who had five receptions for 104 yards with one touchdown.

The Saints and the Falcons have met 111 times in the regular season. Four of the last six meetings between the two clubs have been by three points or fewer - including both meetings in 2024. The Saints defeated Atlanta, 20-17 at the Caesars Superdome on Nov. 10, with the Falcons win being by a 26-24 edge in that season's first meeting on Sept. 29. The Falcons have lost five consecutive games after 3-2 start and are coming off a 30-27 overtime loss to the Panthers at Mercedes-Benz Stadium on Sunday.

THE HEAD COACHES



Named the 19th head coach in New Orleans Saints history on February 11, 2025 Kellen Moore joined the Black and Gold after serving as the offensive coordinator for the

Philadelphia Eagles in 2024. Under the guidance of Moore, quarterback Jalen Hurts and running back Saquon Barkley both had career years. Hurts finished with a career-high 103.7 passer rating, en route to Super Bowl LIX MVP honors. Barkley, who was named the 2024 National Football League Offensive Player of the Year by the *Associated Press*, had one of the best seasons on the ground in NFL history, leading the league with a franchise-record 2,005 rushing yards in the regular season. His 2,504 rushing yards including the postseason were a league record, earning Pro Bowl and All-Pro honors. The 2024 Eagles offense ranked eighth overall in net yards per game [367.2] and seventh in points per game [27.2]. Philadelphia rushed for a single-season club record 3,048 yards [sixth-best in NFL history] and finished second in the league in rushing yards per game [179.3]. Before joining the Eagles in 2024, Moore served as offensive coordinator of the Los Angeles Chargers in 2023 and the Dallas Cowboys from 2019-22 after starting his coaching career as quarterbacks coach in Dallas in 2018. In four seasons as offensive coordinator of the Cowboys, Moore's unit ranked second in the NFL in total offense [391.0 net yards per game] and scoring [27.7 points per game]. The Dallas offense was also the league's fourth-best passing offense [264.4 net yards per game] and ranked seventh in rushing offense [126.6 yards per game] over that span.

Moore played quarterback at Boise State [2007-11] before playing six seasons in the National Football League with the Detroit Lions [2012-14], Dallas Cowboys [2015-17].

Personal: Born July 5, 1988, in Prosser, Washington. He and his wife, Julie, have two daughters, Halle and Madelyn, and two sons, Kyler and Beckham. His younger brother, Kirby, is the offensive coordinator at the University of Missouri.

Raheem Morris was named the 19th head coach in Atlanta Falcons history on Jan. 25, 2024. In his first



season with the Falcons, Morris finished with a 4-2 record against NFC South opponents. Atlanta finished sixth in offensive yards per game [369.8], fifth in passing yards per game [239.3] and tenth in rushing yards per game [130.5]. Defen-

sively, the Falcons finished the season third in opponent plays of 20-or-more yards, allowing just 52 [eight rushing, 44 passing] throughout the season. Running back Bijan Robinson and special teamer KhaDarel Hodge both were elected to their first-career Pro Bowls after the 2024 season, while guard Chris Lindstrom was elected to his third consecutive [2022-24]. Drake London, Robinson and Michael Penix Jr. combined to make the Falcons the first team in NFL history with a 300-yard passer, 175-yard receiver and 150-yard rusher each under the age of 25 in the same game [Week 18]. In his sophomore season, Robinson finished the season third in the NFL in rushing yards [1,456], fifth in rushing touchdowns [14] and fifth in receiving yards [431], among running backs, making his first Pro Bowl appearance.

During his three-year tenure with the Rams as defensive coordinator, Los Angeles made two postseason appearances and captured a title in Super Bowl LVI. From 2021-23, Los Angeles' defense recorded the fourth-best red-zone efficiency rating and the seventh-fewest rushing yards per game in the NFL. His 2023 unit was one of the youngest in the NFL, but helped the Rams earn a playoff berth and featured third-round rookie defensive lineman Kobie Turner, a finalist for the AP Defensive Rookie of the Year Award. Turner and Byron Young tallied a combined 17 sacks, finishing first and second among all rookies. Turner's nine sacks matched three-time NFL Defensive Player of the Year Aaron Donald's franchise rookie record [nine in 2014], while Young's eight sacks ranked third among rookies in franchise history.

Born and raised in Newark, N.J., Morris played safety at Hofstra from 1994-97 and graduated with a degree in physical education.

SERIES HISTORY

The Saints lead their regular season series with the Falcons, 56-55, with New Orleans holding a 26-12 advantage over the Falcons since 2006. Since 1991, 38 games have been decided by eight points or less. The Falcons had a 10-game winning streak from 1995-99, which remains the Saints' longest winless streak against an opponent. New Orleans took 13-of-16 in the rivalry from 1986-94 and Atlanta won nine-straight over the fledgling Saints from 1969-73. Atlanta's most recent mastery over a five-year period ended with a 21-19 win for New Orleans at the Georgia Dome on Nov. 22, 2000. Eight games in the series have gone into overtime.

In the 111 regular season games of the series there has been:

- 2,388 points scored by New Orleans, 2,454 allowed.
- A ten-game Atlanta winning streak from 1995-99.
- A six-game win streak for New Orleans from 1986-89.
- 46 games decided by double-digits.
- 18 games decided by 21 or more points.
- 56 games decided by seven points or less.
- 4 games decided by one point.
- A 38-point win by Saints [11/1/87] - Biggest Saints win.
- A 55-point loss by Saints [9/16/73] - Biggest Saints loss.
- Four shutouts - Two by each club, the most recent a 38-0 Saints win in Atlanta on 11/1/87.
- Eight overtime games— four wins by each club.

LAST MEETING

New Orleans Saints 20, Atlanta Falcons 17; November 10, 2024 @ Caesars Superdome - New Orleans broke a seven-game losing streak, holding on to defeat their division rivals as **Darren Rizzi** was successful in his debut as interim head coach.

New Orleans was led by an efficient and explosive performance through the air from **Derek Carr**, who completed 16-of-25 passes [64.0 pct.] for 269 yards with two touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 126.9 passer rating. Carr and WR **Marquez Valdes-Scantling** connected on two touchdowns. Seeing his first significant action for the Black and Gold, Valdes-Scantling caught three passes for 109 yards [36.3 avg.]. RB **Alvin Kamara** finished with 109 yards from scrimmage as he became the franchise's all-time rushing leader.

The New Orleans defense held the Falcons scoreless on four drives in the fourth quarter to allow Saints to maintain their lead. Three crucial fourth quarter splash plays took place. DE **Cameron Jordan** dropped QB **Kirk Cousins** to force a field goal attempt that was missed, S **Tyrann Mathieu** picked off Cousins in Saints territory and DE **Chase Young** dumped the signal-caller for a significant loss on a sack/forced fumble to preserve the victory.



SEASON GAME SUMMARIES

WEEK 1: Arizona Cardinals 20, New Orleans Saints 13; September 7 @ Caesars Superdome - The New Orleans Saints fell to the Arizona Cardinals in the 2025 season opener for both teams, despite rebounding from a 20-10 third quarter deficit to come within an end zone throw of a game-tying touchdown.

Heroics on offense, defense and special teams aided the Black and Gold in a promising fourth quarter. With 4:40 left in the contest, Saints DT Bryan Bresee blocked a 46-yard field goal attempt. QB Spencer Rattler then converted a trio of first downs on throws to TE Juwan Johnson and WR Devaughn Vele and a 12-yard scramble by the signal-caller to set up a 28-yard field goal by K Blake Grupe with 2:44 left.

New Orleans then forced a three-and-out, punctuated by a third down sack of Cardinals QB Kyler Murray by CB Alontae Taylor for a 15-yard loss to get New Orleans the ball back with 1:49 left.

Rattler helped advance the Saints to the Cardinals 18-yard line to set up three tries at the end zone, the closest being a laser to Johnson that was broken up by Arizona defenders Jalen Thompson and Budda Baker.

Rattler completed 27-of-46 passes for 214 yards and carried four times for 29 yards. Johnson led the Saints in receiving with eight grabs for 76 yards. Murray completed 21-of-29 passes for 163 yards with two TDs and a 108.8 passer rating, carrying seven times for 38 yards. New Orleans RB Alvin Kamara's first half 18-yard rushing touchdown was the 1,000th touchdown scored at the Caesars Superdome.

New Orleans outgained Arizona through the air, 208-130, but the Cardinals held the ball for 33:46 of the contest to win the time of possession battle. The loss snapped a six-game winning streak for the Saints in season openers. The Saints fell to 15-17 against the Cardinals in the all-time regular season series.

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New Orleans then forced a three-and-out, punctuated by a third down sack of Cardinals QB Kyler Murray by CB Alontae Taylor for a 15-yard loss to get New Orleans the ball back with 1:49 left. It was Taylor's sixth career sack, tied for the most by a Saints cornerback.

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Week 2: 49ers 26, Saints 21; September 14, 2025 @ Caesars Superdome - The Saints dropped their second game of the season to the 49ers, despite bouncing back from a 26-14 early fourth quarter deficit to have a chance of winning the game in the final minutes.

"We've got to play cleaner football, in all three phases," said Coach Kellen Moore. "There's only so many opportunities in these games and you have to value each and every opportunity in all three phases, and when they present themselves you've got to take advantage of them because there's only so many."

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SEASON GAME SUMMARIES

An impressive drive and defensive stops paved the way for New Orleans to be back in it in the very end. After going down two scores with 12:18 left in the fourth, QB Spencer Rattler and company made some magic happen, converting three first downs to WR Chris Olave and RB Alvin Kamara to set up an eventual three-yard TD to WR Devaughn Vele. The score capped off a 13 play, 71-yard drive in just six minutes flat to bring the Saints back within five. After two three-and-out drives by both teams, Rattler led a charge that just fell short. Starting on the New Orleans' six yard-line with 2:40 left, the signal-caller picked up two first downs before the 49ers defense became too much to handle. Rattler completed 25-of-34 passes (73.5 pct.) for 207 yards with career-highs of three passing TDs and a rating of 118.1. He also carried four times for 14 yards.

Mac Jones went 26-of-39 for 279 yards and threw three TDs with a 113.1 rating. New Orleans outgained San Francisco on the ground, 121-77, but the 49ers beat the Saints in passing yardage, 344-307, and were 53% [8-for-15] on third down to New Orleans' 36% [four-for-11].

Week 3: Seahawks 44, Saints 13; September 21, 2025 @ Lumen Field - New Orleans' season continued to get off to a rocky start, as they fell to the Seahawks at Lumen Field.

The Saints got off to a solid start with the ball first and QB Spencer Rattler completed a pass to WR Chris Olave and RB Alvin Kamara gained seven yards to put the team near midfield. However the drive stalled out and the Saints failed to convert on fourth down. After a Seattle first down, the Saints stopped two run plays for one-yard gains, but DT Bryan Bresee was assessed a 12-yard unnecessary roughness penalty on third down that extended a drive and set up a TD. The Seahawks extended their lead to 21-0 by the end of the first quarter, where Seattle rookie WR Tory Horton returned a punt 95 yards for a TD and blocked punt set up a third score. On a drive spanning the first and second quarter, the Saints got on the scoreboard with a Blake Grupe field goal, but the Seahawks took advantage of a long kickoff return to set up a scoring play of a 14-yard pass from QB Sam Darnold to Horton.

The Seahawks took a halftime 38-6 lead, while the Black and Gold kept up their intensity, holding Seattle to a pair of field goals and recording a turnover, while TE Jack Stoll scored his first touchdown. Rattler completed 28-of-39 passes for 218 yards with a TD. Olave had a career-high ten catches.

Week 4: Bills 30, Saints 19; September 28, 2025 @ Highmark Stadium - New Orleans faced a 11-point deficit with 6:42 left in the third quarter and was able to cut it to two with 8:53 left in the game, but the Saints never took the lead. New Orleans rushed for a season-high 189 yards, scoring a touchdown on their first possession for the first time this season. But with Buffalo leading 14-7 in the second quarter, New Orleans was unable to capitalize or score points, when rookie S Jonas Sanker recorded his first career interception near midfield early in the second quarter. QB Spencer Rattler connected with WR Chris Olave for a three-yard TD late in the third quarter to reduce Buffalo's lead to 21-16, followed by a Blake Grupe field goal early in the fourth quarter. But the Bills answered with a four-play, 60-yard drive to gain a nine-point advantage. This was followed by a Saints drive that stalled at the Buffalo 43 on downs and the Bills then took advantage of a roughing the punter penalty to hold onto the ball and kick a field goal with 2:12 left.

Week 5: Saints 26, New York Giants 14; October 5, 2025 @ Caesars Superdome - Spencer Rattler was so fired up by the sight of Rashid Shaheed hauling in his deep throw down the right sideline that the second-year quarterback started springing the length of the field to join the celebration. Rattler's pivotal completion to Shaheed went for an 87-yard touchdown, DB Jordan Howden returned a fumble 86 yards for a score, and New Orleans defeated the turnover-prone Giants 26-14 for the Saints' first win under rookie coach Kellen Moore. "Probably the fastest I ran all game," Rattler quipped when asked about chasing Rashid to the end zone. "Those plays create energy for the whole team, the whole crowd and we definitely want to have more of those."

Such moments had been rare for New Orleans since late last season, which ended with the Saints on a four-game skid before the Moore era began with four more losses to start the 2025 season.

That changed Sunday against the Giants [1-4] - also the previous team to lose to the Saints last Dec. 8. And after the game, the Saints transformed their home locker room - equipped with a sound system and color-changing LED lighting - into "Club Dub" for the first time since beating the Cleveland Browns on November 17.

"It's been a while since we had the fog and the music playing afterward," Howden said. "I almost forgot how that was."

The 37-year old Moore celebrated his first victory since last season's Super Bowl - a game also played in the Caesars Superdome, when he was Philadelphia's offensive coordinator.

"This is a special group," Moore said, praising Saints players' "resiliency to hang in there through some challenging times the first month."

Rattler earned his first victory in 11 career starts, passing for 225 yards without turning the ball over or taking a sack, while Shaheed finished with four catches for 114 yards for the Saints [1-4].

"It feels good to get that first win," Rattler said. "It was a team win. The defense played great. The offensive line was elite."

Giants rookie quarterback Jaxon Dart, who won his first career start in Week Four, passed for 202 yards and two touchdowns, but also turned the ball over three times, the first when the ball slipped from his hand during a scramble in the third quarter. DE Cameron Jordan recovered the football as Dart, laying across Jordan's legs, disgustedly put both hands over his face.

"We had a lot of opportunities and moved the ball just fine," Dart said. "We hurt ourselves. We just kind of gave this game away."

Dart threw his first two career interceptions in the fourth quarter - both caught by Kool-Aid McKinstry for his first career picks.

New York committed five turnovers in all, none more costly than when RB Cam Skattebo was stripped by DT Bryan Bresee at the Saints 12-yard line, giving Howden the chance to scoop the loose ball on the 14 and sprint untouched the other way early in the fourth quarter.

"It was a game-changing play," Moore said.

Indeed, the Giants were threatening to score a go-ahead touchdown when Howden saw the ball on the ground behind the line of scrimmage, picked it up and recalled thinking, "Just run - run for my life." Dart completed his first five passes for 44 yards, capped by his short TD pass to TE Theo Johnson. He mixed in a 20-yard scramble with three more completions during New York's next series, which ended with Dart's 15-yard strike to Johnson for a 14-3 lead.

New Orleans closed to 14-13 on Shaheed's TD - the Saints' longest offensive play since Drew Brees connected with Brandin Cooks for a 98-yard score in 2016.

Shaheed said he tried to make S Tyler Nubin believe he was headed across the field to the left, "and once I saw his hips turn, I broke toward the [right] corner and the rest is history.

It was also Shaheed's sixth career touchdown reception of 53 or more yards, and his third covering at least 68 yards.

After Saints K Blake Grupe missed a 52-yard field goal that would have given New Orleans the lead late in the first half, the Saints got the ball back when LB Demario Davis forced receiver Darius Slayton's fumble at the Saints 35 and S Jonas Sanker recovered.

That led to Grupe's short field goal for a 16-14 Saints lead at halftime.

Week 6: New England Patriots 26, Saints 19; October 12, 2025 @ Caesars Superdome - It's not the fight, it's the finish.

It's not the play it's the precision.

It's not the drive, it's the discipline and details.

The New Orleans Saints [1-5] lost their third one-score game this season in the Caesars Superdome, falling 25-19 to the New England Patriots.

Add that to earlier losses against the Arizona Cardinals [20-13] and San Francisco 49ers [26-21] and the Saints have riddled themselves with "couldas" and "wouldas," not not filled the holes with finished business.

"Tough," cornerback Alontae Taylor said. "I think it speaks volumes for us, though. Teams ain't just blowing us out like we're just trash. I think we're right there, and we've just got to find that hump and just stay consistent with that and try to get some wins under our belt."

Sunday followed a similar pattern.

Quarterback Spencer Rattler was efficient and turnover-free - 20 of 26 for 227 yards with no interceptions, but no touchdowns. New Orleans split success in its two red zone trips - a short field goal by Blake Grupe and a one-yard touchdown run by Taysom Hill - and settled for field goals when drives stalled at the New England 30-, 20- and 36-yard lines.

Grupe's last field goal, a 54-yarder with 13:41 left in the contest, pulled New Orleans to within 25-19. And the defense, which struggled while allowing the Patriots to convert six of 13 times on third down, forced punts on consecutive New England possessions.

The Saints began their final two possessions of the contest at their own 25- and 10-yard lines. The first ended after two plays when tight end Juwan Johnson caught a pass from Rattler over the middle and lost a fumble after a 14-yard gain to the 50, and the second ended after the offense gained 28 yards on five plays.

The Patriots converted one last third down on their final drive - a 21-yard pass on third-and-11 from their own 30-yard line with 2:40 left - that allowed them to run out the clock.

New England quarterback Drake Maye [18 of 26 for 261 yards and three touchdowns, with no interceptions] had completions of fourth-and-four and third-and-11 [twice] in the second half, while all three touchdown passes came on first down in the first half.

"You're guarding pretty good receivers," Taylor said, noting Maye's ability to extend plays and five receivers extra time to uncover. "They're finding ways, and Drake and them have a pretty good connection.

"So you're just going to find a guy open and throw the ball. We've just got to tightend up on our end. if we've got to cover longer, then we've got to cover longer."

Even though the Patriots didn't convert the game's lone turnover into points, they siphoned 2:45 off the clock and pinned New Orleans deep with a punt. The Saints took possession at their 10 with 5:51 left in the contest.

"It says in the Word, like, don't get tired in doing good," Johnson said. "We have a lot of stuff that we're doing that's good, so don't get tired in doing it. You're going to be rewarded when the time is right. The time isn't right, but one thing we're going to do is just keep working, clean up a few things and that's where we're at."

"Our red zone efficiency needs to be a little better, that's something we're going to clean up and be a little more efficient. I had a turnover, so obviously clean that up."

"The biggest thing is just being better and sound. It's just little things that a lot of people don't see, but we see. We'll clean up, we'll do better, we'll come out with a better attitude and a different result next week."

Several winning elements have been displayed. The Saints continue the quest to minimize - if not eliminate the costly ones.

"At the end of the day we did not take advantage of the opportunities that were presented to us," Head Coach Kellen Moore said. "Every game is going to have those opportunities, and you have got to take advantage of them. They won the turnover ratio, they won some of the situational stuff and that's how this game was decided."

"I have got to find a way for myself to coach better, to put ourselves in better situations to be more successful as a football team. Because there is too much good and not enough in those little margins [to be losing]."

Week 7: Chicago Bears 26, New Orleans Saints 14; October 19, 2025 @ Soldier Field - The piecemeal approach to winning National Football League games continued to fail the New Orleans Saints on Sunday in Chicago.

Flashes of effectiveness [defensive stops, a forced turnover, two impressive touchdown drives] again could not sufficiently puncture a thicker shield of futility [four turnovers including three interceptions, no run game against the Bears, inability to stop the run], and the Saints dropped their sixth game in seven outings, 26-14 to the Bears at Soldier Field.

A promising defensive start included a three-and-out punt to open the game, a field goal allowed after the offense committed a turnover deep in New Orleans territory and an interception off Bears QB Caleb Williams. But that buckled under the weight of 222 rushing yards and two touchdowns allowed on 40 carries.

And an offensive flurry that produced consecutive touchdown drives of 91 and 80 yards, each ending on passes from QB Spencer Rattler to WR Chris Olave, was negated by four Rattler turnovers and an invisible run game [44 yards on 17 carries].

Saints first-year coach Kellen Moore echoed the sound of sameness to explain the outcome.

"The theme of that game...we had our chances," Moore said. "I thought our guys battled. I thought our guys put [us] in really good position in the middle of the game to come back and get ourself back in it. But then we just couldn't keep it going. Credit to those guys – they played better than us, they coached better than us. We've got to find the formula that works."

New Orleans has shown it has the ability to create the elements of the formula. It hasn't been able to create them consistently and sustain them long enough for the scoreboard to reflect the mix.

Rattler [20 of 32 for 233 yards and two TDs, and sacked four times for -24 yards] had been masterful in his caretaking the first six games. He entered Sunday with one turnover – an interception almost a month ago against Seattle – and six touchdowns. But he was sacked and lost a fumble on the Saints' opening possession, after New Orleans' defense forced a punt on the game's opening drive. And after the Saints punted and Blake Grupe missed his sixth field goal this season to end the second and third drives, Rattler's pass intended for Mason Tipton was intercepted and returned to the Saints 30-yard line to conclude the fourth drive.

Week 8: Tampa Bay Buccaneers 23, Saints 3; October 26, 2025 @ Caesars Superdome - An inspired defensive effort and a quarterback change wasn't enough for the New Orleans Saints on Sunday, as they dropped a 23-3 decision to the Tampa Bay Buccaneers at the Caesars Superdome.

The Saints turned the ball over four times [two interceptions, one a pick-six] to allow the Bucs to solidify their grip on the NFC South at 6-2. The loss dropped the Saints to 1-7.

Rookie Tyler Shough entered the game with 3:57 to play in the third quarter and the Saints down 17-3 and promptly completed his first pass for six yards to Taysom Hill. Shough's first series ended when Tampa safety Antoine Winfield Jr. took the ball away from Saints receiver Chris Olave for an interception. Starter Spencer Rattler was 15 of 21 for 136 yards with a lost fumble and pick-six, leading the Saints to just three points [48-yard Blake Grupe field goal]. Shough finished 17 of 30 for 129 yards.

The Saints defense played exceptional football in the first half, not allowing the Bucs' offense to score while sacking quarterback Baker Mayfield three times and forcing him to fumble once. Tampa had just 80 yards of offense in the first half. The Saints defense also had a goal-line stand and came close to a second one before Tampa scored on a 1-yard dive in the third quarter.

Saints running back Alvin Kamara joined another exclusive list Sunday when he became the fifth running back in NFL history to have 600 or more receptions. He entered Sunday's game against the Tampa Bay Buccaneers needing two receptions to hit the milestone and accomplished that in the final minute of the second quarter. He had two receptions for 24 yards and six carries for 21 yards.

Luke Fortner started at center for the Saints, replacing longtime starter Erik McCoy, who is out for the season with a biceps injury. Running back Devin Neal saw his most extensive action of the season as the Saints played without Kendre Miller, who was lost for the season in Week Seven because of a knee injury. Rashid Shaheed had nine receptions for 75 yards and Chris Olave added eight grabs for 63 yards.

Week 9: Los Angeles Rams 34, Saints 10; November 2, 2025 @ SoFi Stadium - It seemed less about what New Orleans didn't do Sunday against the Los Angeles Rams, as it was about what the Rams did - clinically, repeatedly and thoroughly - in a 34-10 Rams victory at SoFi Stadium in Inglewood, Cal.

The Rams [6-2] scored touchdowns on three of their first four possessions, piled up 77 offensive plays and 438 yards, registered a lopsided time of possession advantage [43:53 to 16:07] and prevented the Saints [1-8] from conjuring much hope in the first NFL start for Saints rookie quarterback Tylyer Shough.

Shough displayed moments of promise while completing 15 of 24 passes for 176 yards and the first touchdown pass of his career, with one interception. But the Rams ball-hogged to a gluttonous level, keeping the Saints offense off the field and helping set the state for Los Angeles' defense to allow just 40 offensive plays, 224 yards and ten first downs.

And a week after New Orleans' defense played arguably its best game this season in a 23-3 loss against Tampa Bay, it couldn't get off the field [the Rams converted half of their 14 third-down attempts and both fourth down tries, and New Orleans didn't force da turnover] and was shredded in the red zone, where Los Angeles scored on four of five trips.

"They controlled so many of the situational football plays," Saints coach Kellen Moore said. "They were able to play a lot more efficiently, run the football better. But third downs, red zone, fourth downs - they were able to control the ball in so many ways." "We didn't get enough shots at it. We didn't get enough opportunities. We've got to play obviously a lot better. A lot of this comes down to the details and the fundamentals of the football game. Sometimes it's a simple game; we've got to play better and give ourselves more opportunities.

"When you look at it, we had 40 snaps on offense - probably an all-time low - and they had 77. So they obviously controlled the ball for much of this game."

When the Saints went three-and-out on their first two possessions and the Rams scored touchdowns on two of their last three - a 12-play, 88-yard drive and an 11-play, 62-yard drive that lasted a combined 12:36 - it was a harbinger of things to come. New Orleans manufactured an eight-play, 44-yard drive in the second quarter that ended with a 39-yard field goal by Blake Grupe to cut its deficit to 13-3.

And when the Rams responded with a three-play, 65-yard punch to push the lead to 2--3 with 6:25 in the half, the teams traded possessions - the Saints punted, the Rams missed a field goal - before the Saints countered with their only touchdown.

The six-play, 71-yard drive began with 54 seconds left in the second quarter and included Shough completions to receiver Rashid Shaheed [13 yards], tight end Juwan Johnson [eight yards], receiver Chris Olave [27 yards], and a roughing the passer penalty that pushed the ball to the Rams' 11-yard line.

On first down from there, Shough found Johnson open a few yards in front of the goal line. Johnson made the catch, spun around a tackle attempt and lunged into the end zone for Shough's first touchdown, and halved the Rams' lead to 20-10 entering halftime.

But that was as far as the momentum went.

Los Angeles opened the second half with an 8-yard touchdown drive that required 16 plays, lasted 9:46 and included two third-down conversions and one fourth-down conversion.

Stafford was sacked twice, by Chase Young and Jonah Williams. Young raised his season total to three sacks in four games, second-most on the team. But Stafford mainly was surgical, completing 24 of 32 passes for 281 yards and four touchdowns, with no interceptions. And with Kyren Williams adding 114 rushing yards and a touchdown on 25 carries, the Saints' defense was in a quandry.

Shough will now look to build off his performance.

"I thought there were some positives that came out of the game from Tyler's perspective," Moore said. "I thought he threw it well. I thought that two-minute drive was big-time football right before the half. Even at the end I thought he made a couple of really good plays to quickly get us down in the red zone and we weren't able to run the football and get a first down."

Week 10: New Orleans Saints 17, Carolina Panthers 7; November 9, 2025 @ Bank of America Stadium - No need to overdramatize the New Orleans Saints' 17-7 victory over Carolina at Bank of America Stadium in Charlotte, N.C. In the grand scheme it was the second win in New Orleans' 10 games and in a business measured by wins and losses, everything based on that reality.

But the tingly feeling that tickled fans, and the music inside Club Dub that Saints players blared inside the Visitors' locker room in Carolina, probably felt and sounded like a mixture of relief and hope.

The relief came in the form of a much-needed victory in New Orleans' most complete game of the season, where offense, defense and special teams each ponied up and shared the winnings.

The hope came in the form of a rookie quarterback, Tyler Shough, who made his second career start.

New Orleans' defense came up with two turnovers, held Carolina to 175 yards and produced stops on six of nine third-down attempts; the special teams blocked a field goal and added a field goal; and the offense produced 388 yards and chewed up 33-21 in time of possession on 67 plays.

But Shough, the Saints' second-round pick this year, likely left the biggest imprint. He completed 19 of 27 passes for 282 yards and two touchdowns, with no interceptions. He had touchdown passes of 62 yards to receiver Chris Olave and 30 yards to tight end Juwan Johnson, and added another 52-yard completion to Johnson, as New Orleans [2-8] evened its record to 1-1 in his starts.

"Just a great feeling," Shough said. "I think my favorite moment was just seeing everybody in the locker room, dapping everybody up and just kind of the work that everyone has put in to this point. Just a great team win. The defense, special teams, everybody had an impact on the game."

PHIL GALIANO**

Phil Galiano is in his first season as the Saints' special teams coordinator and his seventh campaign in New Orleans, spending his first six years as the club's assistant special teams coach. Galiano is a veteran in the coaching ranks with 25 years of experience, including nine seasons in the NFL.

Galiano's work over the past six years with Darren Rizzi, who served as coordinator from 2019-24, helped make the kicking game an important key to victory for New Orleans. On coverage units, J.T. Gray's 93 tackles rank first in the NFL, with the special teams ace selected as an *Associated Press* All-Pro three times. The punting game has produced the top five seasons in club history for punts inside-the-20-yard line. Since 2019, the Saints have excelled in the return game. Over the six-season period, the team has been ranked fifth in the NFL in punt return average (10.4) and are tied for second in the league with three punts returned for touchdowns. The coverage units have allowed the third-lowest punt return average (7.0).

Special teams continued to be a bright spot for New Orleans in 2024, highlighted by Gray being selected as an All-Pro after recording an NFL-best 26 coverage tackles and one blocked punt. New Orleans ranked first in the NFL in opponent starting field position after kickoffs (28.2), punts inside-the-20 yard line (franchise-record 41), fifth in punt return average (12.5), seventh in opponent field goal percentage (78.6), eighth in opponent punt return average (7.6) and tenth in field goal percentage (87.1). Two blocked field goals were crucial in a pair of three-point victories. K Blake Grupe made 27-of-31 field goal attempts, six-of-eight from 50+ yards, an 87.1 percentage and scored 112 points. WR/RS Rashid Shaheed returned a punt for a touchdown for the second consecutive season.

A three-year starter at safety for Shippensburg, Galiano served as a tri-captain during his senior campaign. He helped lead the Raiders to consecutive winning seasons (1997-99). The Norristown, Pa. native graduated a degree in business administration.

COORDINATOR CORNER


**OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR
DOUG NUSSMEIER**

Doug Nussmeier is in his first season as the Saints' offensive coordinator and tenth campaign as a coach in the National Football League. A 24-year coaching veteran, Nussmeier returns to New Orleans after originally being a fourth round pick (116th overall) of the Saints in the 1994 NFL Draft out of Idaho.

Nussmeier joins the Saints after spending the 2024 season as quarterbacks coach of the Philadelphia Eagles under Saints Head Coach Kellen Moore, who served as offensive coordinator, where he proved to be a key piece of their Super Bowl LIX Champion offensive coaching staff. Jalen Hurts flourished under Nussmeier's tutelage, posting a career-high 103.7 passer rating, fifth in the league and tying for the fifth-most rushing touchdowns (14) in the league (first among quarterbacks).

Nussmeier rejoined the NFL with the Dallas Cowboys in 2018, after previously spending two seasons with the St. Louis Rams from 2006-07 as quarterbacks coach. After serving on the Cowboys staff from 2018-22, he served as quarterbacks coach of the Los Angeles Chargers in 2023. In between, he spent 13 seasons coaching at the collegiate level, where he tutored eight different players who were selected in the first or second round of the NFL Draft.

Nussmeier finished his career at the University of Idaho as the program's all-time leading passer with 10,824 career passing yards over five years (1989-93). He won the Walter Payton Award in 1993, which was at the time given annually to the top player in NCAA Division 1-AA after throwing for a program-record 33 touchdown passes and leading the Vandals to a national semifinal berth. Nussmeier was named Big Sky Conference Offensive Player of the Year in 1992 and was inducted into the University of Idaho Athletic Hall of Fame in 2008.

A Portland, Ore. native, Nussmeier and his wife, Christi, have two sons, Garrett and Colton, and a daughter, Ashlynn. Garrett is in his fifth season as a quarterback at LSU.

COORDINATOR CORNER


**DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR
BRANDON STALEY**

Brandon Staley is in his first season as the Saints' defensive coordinator. Staley is a 19-year coaching veteran with three as head coach of the Los Angeles Chargers.

This will be Staley's second stint as a defensive coordinator after leading the Los Angeles Rams to finish first in the NFL in total defense in 2020.

Staley arrived in New Orleans after serving most recently as assistant coach/defense of the San Francisco 49ers in 2024. Working with multiple position groups, as well as aiding 49ers Head Coach Kyle Shanahan, the San Francisco defense finished the season ranked eighth in the NFL in opponent net yards per game (317.4) and fifth against the pass (192.8 ypg.). DL Nick Bosa was selected to the Pro Bowl after recording nine sacks, one interception, one forced fumble and one recovery. ILB Fred Warner was selected to the Pro Bowl, Associated Press All-Pro and PFWA All-NFL, as he registered 131 tackles (76 solo), two interceptions returned for 70 yards, including a 45-yard touchdown return and four forced fumbles. Saints CB Issac Yiadom led the team with a career-high three takeaways.

During his tenure as Chargers head coach, Staley led Los Angeles to a 24-24 record and guided the franchise to its first postseason appearance since the 2018 season. In his final season with the Chargers (2023), Staley helped QB Justin Herbert continue one of the best starts to a career in NFL history as no quarterback has more completions or passing yards over the first four seasons of a career than Herbert. Staley also saw WR Keenan Allen and LB Khalil Mack put together career seasons and earn themselves nods to the Pro Bowl Games roster. Before becoming an NFL coach, Staley spent 11 seasons coaching at the collegiate level. In 2016, Staley earned National Coordinator of the Year honors for Division III.

A native of Perry, Ohio, Staley played collegiately as a quarterback at the University of Dayton for four seasons (2001-04) before finishing at Division II Mercyhurst College in 2005. He and his wife Amy, have three sons, Colin, Will and Grant.

JOEL THOMAS**

Joel Thomas, a 25-year coaching veteran, returns to New Orleans to tutor the clubs running backs in 2025. He previously spent nine years with the Black and Gold (2015-23). After spending the 2024 season coaching the New York Giants running backs, the Port Angeles, Wash. native returns to New Orleans with a additional title of associate head coach.

During Thomas' initial nine-year tenure in tutoring the Saints running backs, the Black and Gold tied for second in the NFL with 161 rushing touchdowns and his backs registered 25 individual 100-yard performances. Under his tutelage, Alvin Kamara, the Saints' all-time rushing yardage leader, earned five consecutive Pro Bowl selections (2017-21) and was the only NFL player with at least 1,160 total yards from scrimmage in each of the seven seasons he first coached him, three of them 1,500 or more.

In 2023 under Thomas, Kamara became the franchise's all-time leader in yards from scrimmage, rushing touchdowns and total touchdowns. Thomas also coached Mark Ingram II, New Orleans' all-time rushing leader from 2021-24 (6,500 yards), for six years, including two 1,000-yard campaigns. During Thomas' first New Orleans tenure, the Saints ranked in the top six in the NFL in rushing three times (2017, 2018 and 2020).

With the Giants in 2024, Thomas oversaw the development of rookie tailback Tyrone Tracy Jr., a fifth round pick. Tracy earned PFWA All-Rookie when he carried 192 times for 839 yards (4.4 avg.) with five TDs to rank second among NFL rookies for the season and New York rookies all-time in rushing yards. He added 38 receptions for 284 yards with one TD to tally 1,123 yards from scrimmage, the fifth-highest total among NFL rookies in 2024 and fourth among Giants rookies all-time.

Thomas lettered as a running back at Idaho from 1993-98 and still holds Vandals career records with 3,929 rushing yards and 51 touchdowns. He was inducted into the University of Idaho Athletic Hall of Fame in 2008. Thomas earned his degree in communications in 1998.

Thomas and his wife, Ebbie, have two boys, Teyo and Niko.

Numerous Saints players, coaches and administrators are not the only members of their families to make a name for themselves in pro football. 21 Saints players, coaches or front office staff have relatives who have played, coached or served in the front office in the NFL.

Tight Ends Coach Chase Haslett - Father, Jim Haslett, played linebacker for the Buffalo Bills from 1979-85 and finished his playing career with the New York Jets in 1986. Haslett was an assistant for the Los Angeles Raiders, Saints, Pittsburgh Steelers, St. Louis Rams, Washington Redskins, Cincinnati Bengals and Tennessee Titans and was head coach of the Saints from 2000-05, where he guided the franchise to their first playoff victory in 2000 and was named NFL Coach of the Year.

Defensive Pass Game Coordinator Terry Joseph - Cousin Vance Joseph is currently defensive coordinator of the Denver Broncos, was their head coach from 2017-18 and has also been an assistant coach with six other teams, after also playing for the New York Jets and Indianapolis Colts. Younger cousin, Sammy, played for the San Francisco 49ers in 2007.

Senior VP/Asst. GM-College Personnel Jeff Ireland - Stepson of Chiefs Hall of Fame linebacker/center E.J. Holub. Grandson of Eagles running back and Bears personnel executive Jim Parmer.

National Scout Terry Wooden - Brother, JoJo, has been a longtime scout in the NFL Player Personnel ranks.

Run Game Coordinator T.J. Paganetti - Brother, Ryan, has coached with the Philadelphia Eagles and Jacksonville Jaguars. He is currently the Head Coach Research Specialist of the Las Vegas Raiders.

Edges Coach Jay Rodgers - Brother, Jeff, is a longtime NFL assistant who is currently assistant head coach/special teams coordinator for the Arizona Cardinals.

Linebackers Coach Peter Sirmon - Son, Jackson, currently plays for the New York Jets.

Assistant Wide Receivers Coach Kyle Valero - Father, Art, was an NFL assistant for ten years.

Area Scout Matt Phillips - Father, Ted Phillips, worked in the Chicago Bears front office from 1983-2022, including serving his last 24 years as team president.

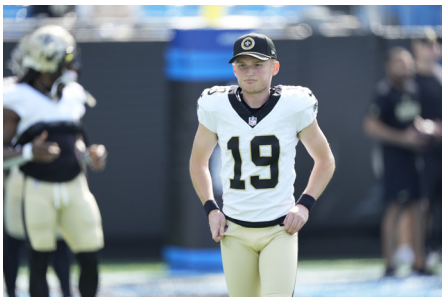

BUCKING THE ODDS

The Saints have a long tradition of finding players as free agents signed after the draft that make an impact immediately or after developing their careers initially on the practice squad. Several undrafted Saints on the roster have played key roles on offense, defense and special teams.

Over the past 22 years, the Saints [2018-22: DB **J.T. Gray**, WR/RS **Deonte Harty** and WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed**] and San Diego/Los Angeles Chargers [2003: G **Kris Dielman**, TE **Antonio Gates** and WR **Kasim Osgood**] are the only two teams to have three players signed as undrafted free agents be selected to a Pro Bowl for the team that originally signed them.



Joining New Orleans following the 2023 NFL Draft after a graduate transfer season at Notre Dame and playing the first four years of his college career at Arkansas State, kicker **Blake Grupe** won a pre-season competition to handle placekicking duties and in three seasons, has drilled 74-of-91 field goal attempts [81.3 pct.], including 27-of-31 kicks [87.1 pct.] in 2024 with a career-long of 57 yards in the season-opening win over Carolina. Grupe drilled two 50+ yard kicks through the uprights in two contests in 2024.

Defensive End **Carl Granderson** joined the club in 2019 as an undrafted free agent out of Wyoming and has appeared in 98 games with 47 starts, posting 274 tackles [163 solo], 33 sacks for a loss of 202.5 yards, eight pass breakups, four forced fumbles and two recoveries, one blocked field goal and one blocked extra point. In 2025, Granderson has been hot from the start, recording 34 tackles [24 solo], a team-high 4.5 sacks and two pass breakups. Granderson is tied for 16th in the NFL in quarterback takedowns. In the first two games of the season, he recorded more than one sack.



Tight end **Juwan Johnson** first led Saints tight ends with four touchdown receptions in 2021, converting to the position that offseason after playing wideout in college and as a rookie in 2020, he signed as an undrafted free agent from Oregon. Johnson led Saints tight ends with a career-high 50 receptions for a club-best 548 yards in 2024, adding three touchdown grabs. He has led the Saints with 17 receiving touchdowns over the past four seasons, seventh over that period among NFL tight ends. In his career, Johnson has played in 77 games [41 starts], making 189 receptions for 2,113 yards with 21 TDs.

In 2025, Johnson is fifth among tight ends in receiving yards and eighth in receiving with 43 grabs for 491 yards [11.4 avg.] with three touchdowns. His 185 receptions as a tight end [four additional were as a WR in 2020] are fourth among the position all-time for the club.

Signing following the 2025 NFL Draft, guard **Torricelli Simpkins III** started all 48 games along the offensive lines at North Carolina Central [2021-23] and South Carolina [2024]. After playing the first three seasons of his career at NCCU, where he was a third-team All-American in 2023, he transferred to USC in 2024. He opened all 13 games at right guard for the Gamecocks and received third-team All-SEC. He competed on all three interior positions in training camp and secured a roster spot based on his play in preseason games. Simpkins received his first career start at left guard at Seattle, Sept. 21, saw extensive action at right guard, Sept. 28 at Buffalo and started at right guard in the Oct. 5 victory over the New York Giants, where the offensive line did not give up a sack.

Signing following the 2024 NFL Draft, linebacker **Isaiah Stalbird** played at Nebraska [2019] and South Dakota State [2020-23]. He played in 64 games and made 251 tackles, 18.5 for loss, three sacks, an interception, 19 pass breakups, five forced fumbles, two recoveries and three blocked punts for the 2022 and 2023 FCS National Champions. Through ten games in 2025, Stallbird has a team-high 11 coverage stops and has added five defensive tackles, including two defensive stops and two special teams tackles in the November 9 17-7 win at Carolina.

Wide receiver **Mason Tipton** stuck on the 53-man roster in 2024 after showing bright spots in the preseason following a college career at Yale, where he posted 132 receptions for 1,067 yards with 19 touchdowns. In 2024, he had 14 receptions for 99 yards. In the 2025 preseason, Tipton led the team in all receiving categories with eight receptions for 158 yards [19.8 avg.] with one touchdown, ranking fifth in the league in receiving yardage. On Oct. 12, against New England, he returned four kickoffs for 89 yards., both career-highs.

DRAFT RECAP

The New Orleans Saints 2025 draft class, the first under first-year Head Coach Kellen Moore features six-of-nine players currently contributing to the team’s 53-man roster, three offensive players, as well as three defenders, with three [T Kelvin Banks Jr., S Jonas Sanker and quarterback Tyler Shough] starting in the November 9, 17-7 win at Carolina, including Shough setting a Saints rookie record by throwing for 282 yards in the winning effort. On offense, Executive Vice President/General Manager Mickey Loomis split the selections among four different positions. Defensively, New Orleans added players at four different positions as the unit makes the switch to Defensive Coordinator Brandon Staley’s 3-4 scheme, a safety, a linebacker and a cornerback currently contributing. With cornerback Quincy Riley recording a pick in Week Seven and Sanker posting one in Week Four, this is the first time since 2019, that two Saints rookie defenders have recorded interceptions.

FROM THE FIELD TO THE SIDELINE

Kellen Moore is the seventh New Orleans Saints head coach to have played in the National Football League, joining Tom Fears, John North, Dick Nolan, Mike Ditka, Jim Haslett and Sean Payton. Moore, who finished his college playing career at Boise State with a record of 50-3, the most wins by a quarterback in NCAA history, played six seasons for the Detroit Lions (2012-14) and Dallas Cowboys (2015-17).



BARKING UP THE RIGHT TREE

With Moore as his offensive coordinator in 2024 with the Eagles, Philadelphia running back Saquon Barkley had one of the best seasons by a tailback in NFL history. The consensus National Football League Offensive Player of the Year, a first-team Associated Press All-Pro and Pro Bowl starter selection, Barkley led the league with a franchise-record 2,005 rushing yards in the regular season, making him just the ninth player in NFL history to post 2,000+ rushing yards in a season, eight-most in league records. Including 499 rushing yards in the playoffs which ranked third all-time, Barkley's 2,504 rushing yards were the most in NFL single-season history (regular season and postseason combined).

NOTHING HURTS

In 2024 in Philadelphia, under the tutelage of Moore who served as offensive coordinator and Saints Offensive Coordinator Doug Nussmeier, who was quarterbacks coach, Eagles signal-caller Jalen Hurts was able to put together one of the best seasons of his career. The Super Bowl Most Valuable Player ranked among the top eight in the league in yards per attempt (fourth, 8.0), passer rating (fifth, career-high 103.7), completion percentage (eight, career-high 6.7 pct.) and total touchdowns (32, eighth). In Super Bowl LIX, Hurts completed 17-of-22 passes [77.3 pct.] for 221 yards, two touchdowns, a 119.7 passer rating and 72 rushing yards with one touchdown on the ground, the most rushing yards by a signal-caller ever in a Super Bowl.

FIVE STRAIGHT

In the Oct. 26-14 win over the New York Giants, the Saints recorded takeaways off five consecutive Giants possessions. This was the first time this occurred in an NFL game since the Kansas City Chiefs intercepted Jets QB Ryan Fitzpatrick on the last five Jets possessions of the contest in a 24-3 Chiefs win on Sept. 25, 2016. It was the first time the Saints had defensive takeaways on five consecutive possessions, since they had five straight interceptions in a 27-3 win at the Phoenix Cardinals on Dec. 22, 1991. In The October 26 contest against the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, the Saints succeeded in a pair of short yardage situations against tall odds, putting the heart they have shown all season on full display in a valiant effort. In the second quarter, with the Buccaneers having first and one at the Saints’ one-yard line, the New Orleans front seven stopped Buccaneers running back Rachaad White from entering the end zone on three straight plays, with defensive end Chris Rumph II and defensive tackle Nathan Shepherd stuffing Tampa Bay running back Sean Tucker on fourth-and-one. In Tampa Bay’s first drive of the third quarter, the Buccaneers advanced to the New Orleans one-yard line following a 22-yard completion from quarterback Baker Mayfield to tight end Cade Otton. On a pair of goal line plays, cornerback Kool-Aid McKinstry successfully defended Mayfield pass attempts to wideouts Sterling Shepard and Emeka Egbuka. On second down, linebacker Demario Davis stuffed Tucker.

Until Tucker reached the end zone on fourth and one, the Saints had successfully defended the one-yard line seven times in the contest, the first time a team had done so since the December 8, 2013 matchup where Tennessee Titans managed seven stops from the one-yard line by the Denver Broncos [credit-ESPN] at Empower Field at Mile High.

Fuaga was an anchor on the Saints offensive line in his rookie campaign, seamlessly moving over to the left tackle position for his first NFL season, where he opened every game for an offense that improved in every rushing metric. Starting all 17 games, he was the first Saint to start every game in his rookie year at the offensive line's most challenging position since J.T. Taylor in 1978. Now in 2025, Fuaga has moved back to his natural right tackle position. After missing the Week Three contest at Seattle, he returned to the lineup in Week Four and helped spur a run game that gained a season-high 189 yards. On October 5, against the New York Giants, he anchored an offensive line that kept QB Spencer Rattler's jersey clean and did not give up a sack.

Cornerback Kool-Aid McKinstry, Alabama [D2] - Selected in the second round of the 2024 NFL Draft with the 41st overall pick out of Alabama, McKinstry arrived in New Orleans having covered many of the nation's top wideouts in the Southeastern Conference for the last three years.

In 2023, the consensus first-team All-American was a semifinalist for the Jim Thorpe Award in his final campaign for the Crimson Tide, making 32 tackles and seven passes defended.

In New Orleans, McKinstry played in 15 games with nine starts as a rookie in 2024, moving into the starting lineup in Week Eight and recorded 44 tackles with seven pass breakups, often tasked with covering an opponent's top wideout.



Through the first ten contests/starts of 2025, he has recorded 46 tackles [36 solo] with, two interceptions and a club-best seven pass breakups, tied for 16th in the NFL. Six of the seven passes defended have taken place in the second half of contests, tied for third in the league. The Pinson, Ala. native recorded the first two picks of his career in the October 5 win over the New York Giants, capturing NFC Defensive Player of the Week honors for the first time in his career. On October 26, vs. Tampa Bay, McKinstry played an important role in holding the Buccaneers to 124 net yards passing. On Sunday at the Los Angeles Rams, he tied a career-high with seven tackles [four solo]. In 25 career games with 19 starts, he has career totals of 87 stops [67 solo], two picks, 14 pass breakups and one special teams tackle.

QB Spencer Rattler, South Carolina [D5a] - Selected with the team's first selection in the fifth round [150th overall] out of South Carolina, Rattler completed 900-of-1,313 passes [68.5 pct.] for 10,807 yards with 77 touchdowns, and only 32 interceptions for the Gamecocks [2022-23] and Oklahoma [2019-21].



As a rookie in 2024, Rattler appeared in seven games with six starts, he completed 130-of-228 passes for a Saints rookie-record 1,317 yards with four touchdowns, also carrying 18 times for 146 yards.

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On the season in eight games started/played, Rattler has completed 173-of-256 passes (67.6 pct.) for 1,586 yards with eight touchdowns, five interceptions and an 86.8 passer rating. Rattler has also utilized his feet, carrying 31 times for 167 yards (5.4 avg.).

LB Jaylan Ford, Texas (D5c) - The last of three fifth round draft picks by the club in 2024, Ford was selected out of the University of Texas, where during he posted 287 tackles, 27.5 stops for loss, three sacks, ten pass breakups, six interceptions, four forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries. As a rookie, Ford established a role on special teams, contributing five tackles before suffering a fibula injury in Week 17. Ford has comprised his role as a core special teams player in 2025, making six stops, after recording three on October 19, at Chicago.



DT Khristian Boyd, Northern Iowa (D6) - A sixth round selection, Boyd appeared in 49 career games in college and collected 149 tackles (59 solo), 22.5 stops for loss, 10.5 sacks, five pass breakups and two forced fumbles.



In his final college season, Boyd started all 11 games along the defensive line and had 43 stops (17 solo), 6.5 tackles for loss, 3.5 sacks and a pass breakup, while earning All-Missouri Valley Football Conference first-team and consensus FCS third-team All-American. Following a full offseason, and utilizing his 6-2, 320-pound frame to fit into the Saints' 3-4 alignment under Staley, the Kansas City native led the Black and Gold with two sacks in the preseason, while providing a push up the team's interior defensive line. Boyd made his 2025 regular season debut in Week Four at Buffalo and finished with one tackle. On October 19 at Chicago, he finished with two stops.

LINING THEM UP



One of Head Coach Kellen Moore's first tasks was shoring up the alignment and the overall depth of the Saints offensive line- a unit that saw nine different starting combinations during the 2024 campaign. The line has gelled, now managing a season-long absence of Pro Bowl center Erik McCoy, who suffered a biceps injury in Week Seven, despite, the offensive line staff being forced to employ six different starting combinations.

A franchise that has consistently invested in the offensive line with four first round picks in the last six seasons, the past two campaigns have been no different. On the interior right guard **Cesar Ruiz** is the elder statesman, having been selected in the first round in 2020, having played in 84 regular season contests with 78 starts. In 2025, Ruiz has opened nine-of-ten contests, returning after missing only one game from a high ankle sprain suffered in Week Four.

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In the last two seasons, New Orleans has continued to fortify their offensive line, selecting left tackle **Kelvin Banks Jr.** [ninth overall-2025] and right tackle **Taliese Fuaga** [14th overall-2024].



Banks, 6-5, 315, was selected with the ninth overall pick out of Texas this past April, the highest selection by the Black and Gold since 2005. A three-year starter who opened all 42 games he played in at left tackle for the Longhorns from 2022-24, Banks was the 2024 Outland Trophy winner and a unanimous All-American selection. In his first season, Banks has lined up at the position that he manned flawlessly as a college standout, facing weekly challenges from some of the NFL's elite pass rushers, a leading candidate for league All-Rookie honors.

2024 first round pick Fuaga, immediately moved into left tackle as a rookie after being a two-year starter at right tackle at Oregon State, earning first-team All-American in 2023.

In 2025, the Tacoma, Wash. native became the first Saints rookie to start every game at the position since J.T. Taylor in 1978. In 2025 for his second-team campaign, Fuaga has moved back to the right tackle position he manned in Corvallis.



Luke Fortner is a former University of Kentucky standout who was a third round pick [65th overall] of the Jacksonville Jaguars out of Kentucky in 2022 and has started 35 of the 59 regular season games he has played and two postseason contests in 2023. Acquired by New Orleans in a preseason trade with the Jaguars following an exhibition game by the two clubs, Fortner has been called into action to manage the center position for the Black and Gold for the remainder of the 2025 campaign.

Following the trade of left guard Trevor Penning on November 4, the offensive line is rounded out by OL Asim Richards, who has seen action at right tackle in the absence of Fuaga, including opening the November 9, 17-7 win at Carolina. G/T Dillon Radunz, who started the first two contests at left guard, takes over the position following the trade of Penning. Rookie C/G Torricelli Simpkins II started one game at right guard and one contest at center. T/G Xavier Truss, a rookie from the University of Georgia, was awarded off waivers from Denver at the end of the preseason and provides valuable depth, while developing.

SPECIAL TEAMS OVERVIEW

Saints special teams will benefit from the elevation of Phil Galiano to coordinator, after serving as assistant special teams coach for the past five-and-a-half seasons before taking over coordination of the unit midway through the 2024 season. During Galiano's tenure, the special teams units have consistently ranked among the NFL's leaders in placekicking, coverage and return units, producing Pro Bowlers and AP All-Pros, also setting various club records in placekicking, punting, return game and coverage units Under Galiano's direction, the club has committed to a transition of a mix of seasoned veterans and several promising youngsters.



BLOCK UNIT

New Orleans’ field goal block unit came through big on three occasions in the second half of the 2024 season, two taking place in three-point victories. The field goal block unit’s hard work carried over into the 2025 season opener, as third-year defensive tackle **Bryan Bresee** blocked a fourth quarter 46-yard field goal attempt to give the offense the ball back for a drive where they ended up scoring a field goal.

In the third quarter of New Orleans’ last contest, at Carolina, narrowly holding onto a 10-7 third quarter lead, DT **Nathan Shepherd** blocked a 48-yard field goal attempt. For his efforts, Shepherd was named the Week Ten NFC Special Teams Player of the Week.

New Orleans leads the NFL since the 2024 season with four blocked field goals.

COVERAGE UNITS

Galiano and Assistant Special Teams Coach Kyle Wilber have been tasked with remaking the coverage aspect of the special teams units with the top Six tacklers from the 2024 campaign not on the roster. LB Isaiah Stalbird leads the team with 11 stops through the first ten games.

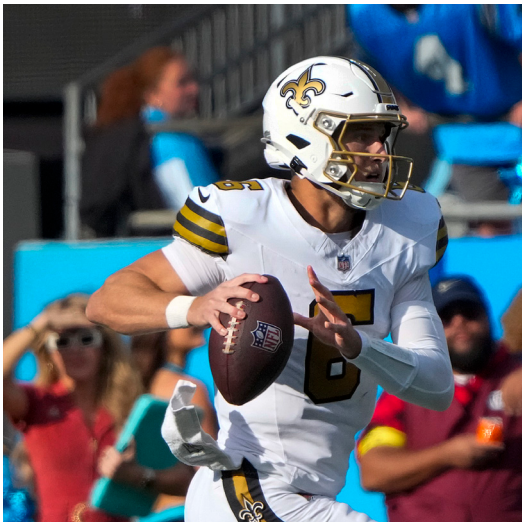

QUARTERBACKS

TYLER SHOUGH

With their eyes on competition and development, the New Orleans Saints selected Tyler Shough (last name pronounced Shuck) out of Louisville with the team’s selection in the second round (40th overall) of the 2025 NFL Draft. In seven seasons at Oregon (2018-20), Texas Tech (2021-23) and Louisville (2024), Shough played in 42 games and completed 599-of-951 passes (63.0 pct.) for 7,820 yards with 59 touchdowns, also carrying 246 times for 733 yards with 11 scores.

Shough made his first career start on Nov. 2, the 40th Saint to start a game at the position. He finished 15-of-24 (62.5 pct.) for 176 yards to go with one second quarter touchdown pass to TE Juwan Johnson and one interception.



In his second career start at Carolina on Nov. 9, he completed 19-of-27 passes for Saints rookie-record 282 yards with two touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 128.9 passer rating. His first touchdown pass was a 62-yard laser to WR Chris Olave, which was the second-longest touchdown thrown by a Saints rookie quarterback, with Archie Manning throwing a 63-yarder to WR Danny Abramowicz on October 3, 1971 against the Houston Oilers.

With the victory, Shough became the first Saints rookie signal-caller to win a start since Dave Wilson (at L.A. Rams, 11/8/81). Overall he became the fourth Saints rookie to win a start, joining Wilson, Manning (1971) and Larry Cipa.

FALCONS VS. SAINTS

The last time a Saints quarterback had 2+ touchdown passes and zero interceptions in one of his first two career starts was Manning [9/26/71 @San Francisco].

TAYSOM HILL

Hill has brought unheralded versatility to the Saints offense and special teams. He's played in 111 games with 51 starts at several positions. He has carried 459 times for 2,489 yards, the most by a Saint not to play running back full-time, with 34 touchdowns, ranked fifth in club records. In the passing game, he has caught 102 passes for 961 yards with 11 touchdowns, completed 194-of-305 passes for 2,388 yards with 11 touchdowns, returned 20 kicks for 489 yards, made one defensive tackle, a forced fumble, 15 special teams tackles and blocked one punt.



After suffering a season-ending knee injury in Week 13 of the 2024 season, Hill aggressively rehabbed to return to action in Week Four. On Oct. 12, vs. the New England Patriots, Hill scored his first rushing touchdown of the season on a one-yard run. He has rushed for 52 yards with one touchdown, caught three passes for 18 yards and completed one pass for 19 yards.

BY THE NUMBERS

1 - With 2,489 rushing yards, 2,388 passing yards and 961 receiving yards, Hill is the only NFL player in the Super Bowl era with 2,000 career passing yards, 2,000 career rushing yards and 900 career receiving yards.

2 - With his standout performance in the the Nov. 17, 2024 35-14 win over Cleveland, Hill picked up his second NFC Offensive Player of the Week honors. In hte contest, he rushed seven times for a career-high 138 yards [career-high 19.7 avg.] with three TDs, tying a career-high. He also caught a team-high and career-high eight receptions for 50 yards and had one kickoff return for 42 yards.

3 - Hill has picked up three conference player of the Week awards, including an NFC Special Teams Player of the Week honor in 2018 at Tampa Bay, when he blocked a punt, joining RB/RS Reggie Bush as only the second Saint to capture conference player of the Week honors in two phases.

10 - With 11 career touchdown passes, 11 career receiving touchdowns and 34 career rushing touchdowns, Hill is the first player to have at least ten career passing touchdowns, ten career receiving touchdowns and ten career rushing touchdowns since Frank Gifford [Pro Football Hall of Fame Class of 1977].

25 - With 2,489 career rushing yards, Hill is ranked 25th all-time for a player not designated as a running back.

34 - Hill's 34 career rushing touchdowns are ranked fifth in record books.

45 - Hill has 45 career touchdowns [rushing and receiving combined], ranked ninth in club record books.

111 - Hill has appeared in 111 career regular season games during his nine-year career, tied for 38th in club record books with Andrus Peat.

575 - Hill's 575 rushing yards in 2022, was the highest rushing yardage total by a Saint who whose primary position is not running back. In fact, Hill has the five biggest single-season non-running back rushing yardage totals.

6,327 - Hill has accounted a total of 6,307 total yards in his nine-year National Football League career [2,388 passing, 961 receiving, 2,489 rushing and 489 kickoff returns].

RUNNING BACKS

ALVIN KAMARA



A talented runner and receiver who was selected by the Saints in the third round of the 2017 NFL Draft out of Tennessee, Alvin Kamara enjoyed an outstanding rookie campaign. He ranked first on the club and sixth in the NFL in yards from scrimmage [1,554], second on the team in rushing and receiving, carrying 120 times for 728 yards [6.1 avg] with eight TDs and a two-point conversion, catching 81 passes for 826 yards [10.2 avg] with five touchdowns and one kickoff return for a touchdown. Kamara set a club rookie record with 14 total scores, tied for second in the NFL and finished first in the league in yards per carry. Kamara was the first Saints offensive rookie selected to the Pro Bowl since Rueben Mayes [1986], as an *Associated Press* second team All-Pro [flex], the club’s first rookie All-Pro since 1993. He was also named *The Sporting News* NFL Rookie of the Year and *Associated Press* NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year.

In 125 career games with 94 starts, Kamara has carried 1,671 times for 7,239 yards [4.3 avg.] with 61 touchdowns and has caught 604 passes for 4,944 yards [8.2 avg.] with 25 touchdowns. Kamara is the franchise’s all-time leader in rushing yards, rushing touchdowns, total touchdowns [87], two-point conversions [7], total yards from scrimmage [12,083], all-purpose yardage [12,837] and first downs [601].

In 2025, Kamara leads the team in rushing with 460 yards with one touchdown and has caught 31 passes for 182 yards for 642 yards from scrimmage after surpassing Tiki Barber and Marcus Allen to move into fifth all-time in NFL record books for receptions by running backs on Oct. 5, vs. the New York Giants. With six more grabs, he would move into a tie with Keith Byars for fourth and with seven take sole possession.

FLY OVER THE FALCONS



Saints RB Alvin Kamara, has enjoyed some of his most prolific performances against Sunday’s opponent, the Atlanta Falcons. With 210 carries for 934 yards [4.4 avg.] and four touchdowns and 67 receptions for 534 yards against the Falcons, the Atlanta native has the highest rushing yardage total and yards from scrimmage total [1,468] against an opponent vs. the Falcons. With 66 rushing yards on Sunday vs. Atlanta, Kamara would become the first Saint with 1,000 yards rushing against an opponent.

SCRIMMAGE LEADER

Since entering the NFL in 2017, Kamara ranks second in the league in yards from scrimmage [12,183], only one of three to have 11,000 over that period. With 1,493 scrimmage yards in 2024, Kamara is the third player since 2000 with at least 1,100 scrimmage yards in each of his first eight seasons, joining Matt Forte and Pro Football Hall of Famer LaDainian Tomlinson.



Kamara’s career scrimmage yards total is the most by an NFL player with a single team over the nine-season period.

WIDE RECEIVERS

CHRIS OLAVE

The 11th overall pick in the 2022 NFL Draft out of Ohio State, this talented wideout made an immediate impact as a rookie, catching 72 passes for 1,042 yards (14.5 avg.) and four TDs, leading the team in receptions, receiving average and receiving yards, while earning September NFL Offensive Rookie of the Month honors as the 24th player since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger to record 1,000 receiving yards as a rookie. Olave became the third Saints rookie to reach 1,000 receiving yards and the first Saints rookie since WR Danny Abramowicz (1967) to lead the team in receiving, receiving yardage and yards per catch in his first campaign.

In 2023, Olave took the next step in his promising-career, leading the team in receiving and receiving yardage for the second consecutive season with 87 receptions for 1,123 yards and five TDs, tying for the team lead. He became the seventh Saint with 85 receptions in a season and the sixth with 1,100 receiving yards in a season.

In 2024, prior to being placed on Injured Reserve in Week Ten (concussion), he led the team’s wide-out corps in receiving with 32 grabs for a club-best 400 yards with one touchdown in eight games. Olave has rebounded to appear in every contest, while leading the team in receiving in 2025 with 60 receptions for 664 yards with four touchdowns. Olave is tied for seventh in the NFL in receiving, ranked 15th in receiving yards and tied for fifth with three other players in third down receptions (17).

In 49 career games with 38 starts, Olave has recorded 251 receptions for 3,229 yards with 14 TDs.

BRANDIN COOKS

The New Orleans Saints added a speedy big-play threat to their offense, when they signed wide receiver Brandin Cooks, who started his National Football League career with the club [2014-16]. Cooks, who was selected 20th overall by New Orleans in the 2014 NFL Draft out of Oregon State, has six career 1,000-yard seasons, which is tied for the fifth-most in the NFL since he was drafted in 2014. Cooks joins Brandon Marshall as the only players in NFL history to record at least 1,000 receiving yards in a season with four different teams. Overall, he has played in 168 career games with 147 starts for New Orleans [2014-16], the New England Patriots [2017], Los Angeles Rams [2018-19], Houston Texans [2020-22] and the Dallas Cowboys [2023-24], posting career totals of 729 receptions for 9,697 yards [13.3 avg.] and 60 touchdowns, to go along with 58 rushes for 341 yards and two scores. Voted as a team captain, Cooks also provides leadership to a youthful receiver room, while making 19 receptions for 165 yards.

DEVAUGHN VELE

This second-year wideout was acquired by the Saints from the Denver Broncos near the conclusion of the preseason. A seventh round pick of Denver out of Utah in 2024, Vele appeared in 13 games with seven starts, recording 41 receptions for 475 yards with three touchdowns, tallying the most receiving yards, receptions and receiving touchdowns by a Broncos' seventh-round draft choice as a rookie. The Saints will look to utilize the San Diego native's 6-5, 210 frame in key spots. On Sept. 14 vs. San Francisco, Vele utilized his size to muscle in a three-yard touchdown grab.

TIGHT ENDS

JUWAN JOHNSON

The former Penn State and Oregon wideout joined the New Orleans Saints in 2020 following the NFL Draft and transitioned to tight end his second season in 2021. Overall, Johnson's 18 touchdown grabs since 2021 lead the team. In 2024, Johnson stepped up after missing most of training camp with a foot injury to play in all 17 games with five starts and make a career-high 50 receptions for a team-best/career-best 548 yards. With 43 receptions for 491 yards with three touchdowns in 2025, Johnson ranked eighth among National Football League tight ends in receptions and fifth in receiving yardage. With seven grabs, Johnson would tie his career-high set last season and with eight set a new one. With 58 receiving yards, he would set a new career-best.

FOSTER MOREAU

This veteran tight end and New Orleans native who was a standout at Jesuit High School and Louisiana State University signed with the Saints in the 2023 offseason. He finished his fifth National Football League season and first with the Black and Gold after spending his first four campaigns with the Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders, who origianlly select-ed him in the fourth round of the 2019 NFL Draft. In his career, Moreau has contributed both as a pass catcher and blocker, appearing in 99 regular sea-son games with 65 starts and has recorded 147 receptions for 1,738 yards [11.8 avg.] with 18 touch-downs, also adding seven special teams tackles. Moreau returned to action in Week Five after suf-fering a significant knee injury in the 2024 season finale.

DE CAMERON JORDAN

New Orleans’ first choice in the 2011 NFL Draft [24th overall] out of the University of California, Jor-dan has played in 236 career regular season games with 235 starts, recording 833 tackles [511 solo], a franchise record 125 sacks for a loss of 8 yards, three interceptions, 68 pass breakups, 15 forced fumbles and 12 fumble recoveries.



Jordan returned from offseason ankle surgery in 2024 to start every game and rank among the team’s leaders on the line, starting all 17 games and making 34 tackles [18 solo], including seven stops for loss, four sacks, an interception and four passes defended. Off-the-field, as a ten-time team captain, Jordan sets the standard for excellence as he was selected as the team nominee for the third time for the National Football League’s Walter Payton Man of the Year award and also has been recognized for his citizenship and commitment to family and com-munity as the 2025 Bart Starr Award winner.

Jordan's leadership and experience has served as a crucial component in a Saints season that faced adversity with a 1-8 start. Embracing a new structure on defense, he has opened every contest and ranks among leaders on the defensive line with 23 tackles [14 solo], 3.5 sacks for a loss of 30.5 yards, one pass breakup and one fumble recovery.

MOST SACKED

Jordan is now one of only 15 National Football League players to have at least 15 sacks against two opponents, 17 against the Tampa Bay Buccaneers and 2 against the Atlanta Falcons, both NFC South divisional rivals. Jordan’s 23 takedowns of former Atlanta QB Matt Ryan are the most sacks a player has had against an individual quarterback in NFL history.

DT BRYAN BRESEE

The team’s first round selection in 2023 out of Clemson after being a three-time All-ACC selection, the Maryland native played in 26 games with 21 starts for the Tigers, producing 54 tackles [35 solo], 15 stops for loss, nine sacks, a forced fumble, an interception and five passes defensed.

Bresee immediately found a role in New Orleans’ interior rotation and appeared in all 17 games, recording 24 tackles, 4.5 sacks and six pass breakups. His sack total was the highest by a Saints rookie defensive tackle since becoming an official statistic [1982] and his pass defense total was the most in club records for a rookie at the position since the statistic was first recorded [1980]. He was also tied for second in the league among defensive tackles.



Bresee enjoyed a breakout sophomore campaign, playing in all 17 games and tied for fourth in the NFL among defensive tackles with a career-high and team-leading 7.5 sacks. In the Oct. 5 win over the Giants, DB Jordan Howden picked up a fumble forced by Bresee and returned it 86 yards for a touchdown. In 2025, Bresee has 25 tackles [eight solo], 1.5 sacks, two passes defensed, one forced fumble and one blocked field goal, playing under a new defensive structure under coordinator Brandon Staley.

DT DAVON GODCHAUX

Davon Godchaux [pronounced duh-VAHN GOD-chaw] returned to his home state to play for New Orleans in his ninth NFL campaign after being acquired from the New England Patriots. Originally a fifth round draft pick [178th overall] of the Miami Dolphins out of LSU in 2017, Godchaux has started 119-of-1 regular season games for the Dolphins [2017-20], Patriots [2021-24] and Saints [2025-], recording 459 tackles [214 solo], 5.5 sacks, 20 stops for loss, three pass breakups, three forced fumbles and one fumble recovery, as well as one solo stop in the 2021 Wild Card Playoff for New England. In 2024, he started all 17 games and posted 67 tackles [24 solo], one pass defensed and one stop for loss. In 2025, he’s opened every contest and recorded 30 tackles [nine solo] and one forced fumble.

DE CARL GRANDERSON

Signed by New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Wyoming in 2019, Granderson posted 17.5 sacks in college and possesses the prototypical frame for an NFL pass rusher. Granderson has become a significant cog in the team’s defensive line rotation with 274 tackles [163 solo], 33 sacks, eight pass breakups, four forced fumbles and two recoveries.

Earning the starting right defensive end position in 2023, Granderson posted a career-high 78 tackles [44 solo], led the team with a career-best 8.5 sacks for a 55-yard loss, one pass defense, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery. Starting all 17 games in 2024, Granderson had 61 tackles, 5.5 sacks, tied for second on the team with Chase Young, a career-high four passes defended, one forced fumble and a blocked extra point. Through the first ten games of the 2025 season, he has a team-leading 4.5 sacks.

DE CHASE YOUNG

Originally selected by Washington with the second overall pick in the 2020 NFL Draft out of Ohio State, this talented edge rusher enters his sixth season and second in New Orleans. In five campaigns for Washington [2020-23], San Francisco [2023] and New Orleans [2024], he’s has appeared in 65 games with 37 starts and recorded 144 tackles [95 solo], 25 sacks, 30 stops for loss, 15 pass breakups, eight forced fumbles and four recoveries. The consensus NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year, Young recorded 7.5 sacks and made multiple splash plays with four forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries in 2020. In 2023, he played in seven games for Washington and nine for San Francisco following a midseason trade and tied his career-best with 7.5 takedowns in helping the 49ers advance to Super Bowl LVIII. In 2025 after missing the first five games with a calf injury, Young has started/played in the lastfive contests, posting ten tackles [six solo], three sacks and three passes defended, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery.

Young has had at least one split-sack, a total of three, in three straight contestss for the first time in his career, including a takedown of Rams QB Matthew Stafford at Los Angeles on Nov. 2.

In New Orleans’ Week Ten matchup against Atlanta last year, Young posted a strip sack/fumble recovery in New Orleans’ 20-17 win.



DE CHRIS RUMPH II

Signed as a free agent in the offseason, Rumph is well-versed in defensive coordinator Brandon Staley’s system. In his career, he’s played in 47 games and made 51 tackles [29 solo], four sacks, two passes defended, one forced fumble, one fumble recovery and 20 special teams tackles, posting a career-best ten coverage stops in 2025.

DT NATHAN SHEPHERD

Originally selected by the New York Jets in the third round of the 2018 NFL Draft out of Fort Hays State, this versatile defensive tackle enters his eighth NFL season, his third campaign with the Saints. The Ajax, Ontario, Canada native has appeared in 116 career games with 48 starts, totaling 227 tackles [115 solo] and 12.5 sacks for a loss of 107.5 yards. In 2025, he has started in six-of-ten appearances and has 29 stops [13 solo] with two sacks and a blocked field goal..

LINEBACKERS

DEMARIO DAVIS

This dependable and sure-tackling defender joined the Saints in 2018 after spending his first six National Football League seasons with the New York Jets and Cleveland Browns. In his career, the Brandon, Miss. native has appeared in 220 regular season games with 206 starts for the Jets [2012-15, 2017], Browns [2016] and the Saints [2018-], recording 1,562 stops [971 solo], 44.5 sacks, four interceptions, 64 pass breakups, six forced fumbles and nine fumble recoveries.

THE CENTURION



Through the first ten games, Davis is the team leader with 91 tackles [42 solo], including five stops for loss, two pass breakups, a team-leading two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery.

PETE WERNER

New Orleans selected this three-year starter from Ohio State in the second round of the 2021 NFL Draft. The Indianapolis native finished his college career playing in 47 career games with 35 starts, recording 185 tackles [111 solo], 16 stops for loss, four sacks, 11 pass breakups, four forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Werner helped power the Buckeyes to the College Football Playoff championship game as a senior in 2020, when he was voted by the Big Ten coaches as a first-team All-Conference selection and a Butkus Award semi-finalist, posting 54 tackles, 2.5 stops for loss, one sack and two forced fumbles.

In five seasons, Werner has played in 66 games with 56 starts and has recorded 384 tackles [242 solo], 2.5 sacks, one interception, seven pass breakups, two forced fumbles, four fumble recoveries and four special teams stops.

In 13 games started/played in 2024, Werner posted 92 tackles [54 solo] and one pass defense. In the 2025 season opener vs. Arizona, making his season debut in the team’s new alignment, Werner tied for the team lead with nine tackles, including one sack.

In ten games in 2025, he has 60 stops, two sacks, three pass breakups and two fumble recoveries to tie for the NFL lead.

SECONDARY

JUSTIN REID

This versatile, hard-hitting, playmaking safety and South Louisiana native returned to his home state after signing with the Black and Gold during the 2025 offseason as an unrestricted free agent. Reid was originally selected by the Houston Texans in the third round (68th overall) in the 2018 NFL Draft out of Stanford. In seven NFL seasons, the former Dutchtown High School standout has played in 116 career regular season games with 112 starts for the Texans (2018-21), Kansas City Chiefs (2022-24) and Saints (2025-), recording 618 tackles (442 solo), 24 stops for a loss, 6.5 sacks, ten interceptions, with one returned 101 yards for a touchdown, 49 pass breakups, three forced fumbles, three fumble recoveries, 15 special teams stops and one blocked kick. Reid has started all 13 postseason contests he has played in and recorded 79 tackles (58 solo), four stops for a loss, 1.5 sacks and five pass breakups, playing for two Super Bowl champion squads as a member of the Chiefs. Reid has started all ten games and has 52 tackles, a split sack and three pass breakups.

CB ALONTAE TAYLOR

Selected by the Saints in the second round (49th overall) of the 2022 NFL Draft out of Tennessee, Taylor shook off early injuries to play in 13 games with nine starts and posted 45 tackles (38 solo) and a club-best 11 pass breakups, ranked fourth among NFL rookies.

Moving to the nickel position in 2023, possessing extensive experience on the inside and the outside, Taylor appeared in all 17 games with 13 starts and recorded 75 tackles, his first two career interceptions and a career-high 14 pass breakups, tied for second on the team and ninth in the NFL.

In 2024, Taylor played in all 17 games with 15 starts and ranked third on the team with a career-high 89 tackles (61 solo), was tied for fourth with four sacks and has added a club-best 16 passes defended and two forced fumbles to tie for the team best. His four sacks were tied for the most by a Saints cornerback with Alex Molden. His pass defense total was ranked fifth in the National Football League.

GET A HAND ON

Taylor’s 16 pass breakups in 2024 were tied for third in the NFC and fifth in the NFL. His 41 since coming into the league in 2022 are tied for fourth.

DB DROP

In the Sept. 8, 2024 season-opening win over Carolina, Taylor became the first Saints defensive back to record three sacks in a contest since the statistic was officially recognized by the NFL in 1982. The only other defensive back to record three sacks on kickoff weekend is former Chargers S Rodney Harrison (vs. Buffalo, 9/6/98). After splitting a sack on October 27 at the Los Angeles Chargers, Taylor’s four sacks are tied for the highest total by a cornerback in Saints record books with Alex Molden’s four in 1997, while the total ranked third among defensive backs and led all cornerbacks. Taylor’s six career takedowns are tied with Molden for the most by a Saints cornerback all-time.

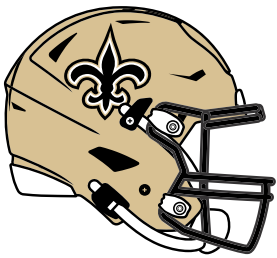

CAROLINA PANTHERS VS. NEW ORLEANS SAINTS SUNDAY, NOV. 9, 2025 • BANK OF AMERICA STADIUM SAINTS POSTGAME NOTES

- The New Orleans Saints picked up their second win of the season over the Carolina Panthers, defeating them 17-7. It improves New Orleans' overall record (regular + post season) to 33-29 against the Panthers and improves their divisional record to 1-1 on the season. It was the Saints' first road win of the season and the first for Head Coach Kellen Moore.
- A Black and Gold victory over the Panthers gives the Saints a 16-15 edge in games played at Bank of America Stadium.
- The Saints will return to action following a Week 11 bye on November 23, when they host the Atlanta Falcons at the Caesars Superdome with a 3:25 p.m. kickoff. The contest will be regionally televised on FOX (WVUE FOX 8 locally).
- The New Orleans offense set season-highs in total net yards (388), net yards passing (266) and time of possession (33:21), while tying season-highs in third down conversions (eight) and fourth down conversions (two).
- QB **Tyler Shough** went 19-of-27 for 282 yards with two touchdown passes, zero interceptions and a 128.9 passer rating. His first touchdown pass was for 62 yards, which was the second longest touchdown throw by a Saints rookie quarterback since Archie Manning threw a 63-yarder to WR Danny Abramowicz on October 3, 1971 against the Houston Oilers.
- With the Saints victory, Shough became the first Saints rookie to win a start since Dave Wilson, when the Saints won at the Los Angeles Rams on November 8, 1981. Overall, he became the fourth Saints rookie to win a start, joining Wilson, Larry Cipa (1974) and Archie Manning (1971). His 282 passing yards are the most by a Saints rookie in a game, which passed Wilson as well.
- RB **Alvin Kamara** shined as he rushed for 83 yards and caught three passes for 32 yards for 115 total yards from scrimmage. He passed RB Ahman Green, Christian McCaffrey and Louisiana native WR Charlie Joiner for 68th place in all-time scrimmage yards. He also passed DeMarco Murray, George Rogers and Nick Chubb for 68th place in all-time rushing yards.
- Kamara played in his 125th game to take sole possession of 29th on the club's all-time games played list, surpassing WR Devery Henderson and S Roman Harper.
- TE **Juwan Johnson** recorded four receptions for a career-high 92 yards with a touchdown, including a career-long reception of 52 yards. His performance today put him over the 2,000 yard mark for his career, which makes him only the fourth Saints tight end with 2,000 yards receiving or more.

- With Johnson's three grabs, it marks his third season of 40 or more catches, which is tied for the third-most by a Saints tight end with Jeremy Shockey (2008-10).
- His touchdown grab in the fourth quarter put him at 21 career touchdown receptions, which moved him into a tie for third in Saints history with Hoby Brenner at the tight end position.
- WR **Chris Olave** recorded five receptions for 104 yards, which led all receivers in both categories, and a touchdown catch for 62 yards. The 62 yard touchdown reception was the longest catch of his career.
- Olave now has ten games of 100 or more receiving yards, which passed Wes Chandler and Donte' Stallworth out of eighth in club record books. He now moves into a tie for sixth with Abramowicz and Henderson.
- With his five catches, he became the 15th Saint with 250 career receptions.
- QB **Taysom Hill** played in his 111th career regular season game, and moved into a tie for 40th on the club's all-time games played list with OL Andrus Peat. Hill played a season-high 25 snaps on both special teams and offense and rushed for 20 yards and attempted a pass.
- The New Orleans defense set season-bests in points allowed (seven), fewest touchdowns allowed (one) fewest net yards allowed (175), fewest net yards passing allowed (102), first downs allowed (13) and passing first downs allowed (six), while tying the season-low for rushing yards allowed (73) and rushing first downs allowed (five).
- Panthers RB Rico Dowdle entered Sunday's game averaging 5.6 yards per carry. He was bottled up against the Saints, gaining just 53 yards on 18 carries (2.9 avg.).
- DE **Cameron Jordan** recorded a sack on Bryce Young, who was the 50th different quarterback he has sacked in his career. He also became the 20th player in NFL history with 125 career sacks, as part of a day where he had two solo stops.
- Jordan also played in his 236th career regular season game and moved into a tie for seventh all-time among NFL defensive linemen in games played with Clyde Simmons and Ted Washington.
- LB **Demario Davis** led the defensive effort with seven tackles (one solo), which put him over the 900-tackle mark for his career as a Saint, reaching 91 stops for the season.
- He played in his 124th game to surpass RB Mark Ingram II on the club's games played list to take sole possession of 32nd, and he played in his 220th career game, surpassing Takeo Spikes for 12th all-time in NFL record books for games played by a linebacker.
- DT **Nathan Shepherd** recorded his second sack of the season and the first blocked field goal of his career. He tallied two solo tackles as well on the day.
- CB **Alontae Taylor** posted five tackles (four solo), his first interception of the season and one pass breakup.
- LB **Pete Werner** tallied six tackles (three solo) a tackle for loss, and a fumble recovery when Panthers QB Bryce Young fumbled in the red zone.

- This was the seventh fumble recovery this season by the New Orleans defense, which ranks second in the league only trailing Pittsburgh.
- LS **Zach Wood** played in his 142nd game on Sunday, moving into a tie with G Joel Hilgenberg for 19th on the club's all-time games played list.
- On coverage units, LBs **Danny Stutsman** and **Isaiah Stalbird** and DE **Chris Rumph** tied for the team lead with two tackles apiece.
- In his first game of the season, WR **Dante Pettis** returned a kickoff 31 yards.

SAINTS HEAD COACH KELLEN MOORE

Opening Statement

Obviously fun game for our guys. Fun to see those guys play together. Three phases coming together, playing complementary football. One phase has a down moment; the other phase picks them up and so I just thought it was a really good example of our team playing together, having a ton of joy as they went through it and I thought the physicality was a positive. We knew that was going to be a physical game with the way those guys play. They're a really good team. They've had a ton of success the last few weeks and so we knew it was going to be a battle.

On what changed for Carolina after the first drive

Yeah, obviously we had some missed opps [opportunities] on that first drive. It was unfortunate, but I thought our guys just hung in there, kept battling, tightened up things a little bit more and so I felt like after that it was pretty good.

On if this felt like the best game the Saints have played

I think in all three phases, just playing complementary football. And we know there's missed opps out there, there's opportunities we want to grow in and we got to talk about and get better because of, but I just felt like all three phases were really playing well together and collectively.

On QB Tyler Shough's performance

Yeah, I thought Tyler took an awesome step today. I thought he made some big-time plays, some off schedule plays. The two to [tight end] Juwan (Johnson), off-schedule, moving within the pocket. I thought he hung in that pocket really, really well, delivered. Can't say enough big things about CO (wide receiver Chris Olave), Juwan, these perimeter guys, the plays that they made.

On the outcome of the blocked field goal

Yeah, I thought the beauty of that was -- the rule is the rule. The ball went past the line of scrimmage, we touched it. Hey, it's their ball. I understand that rule. It's something we talked about a lot -- in the heat of the moment, you see a football and your natural reaction is to recover the thing. So we get to educate ourselves because of that. But I thought the way our guys responded was just phenomenal, respond there to create a turnover right after that.

On the touchdown by TE Juwan Johnson

Yeah, really good play. That's the backside route. You're playing a high-low game on the front side. He worked through his progression, stepped up in the pocket and really found Juwan on the backside of the original play and so I thought it was a really good example of Tyler's ability to move, keep his eyes downfield and make a play.

On if he said anything to Tyler Shough before the touchdown to Juwan Johnson or if it was just a play call

Play call, let him play, he's playing really good.

On Tyler Shough's composure in those third-and-medium, third-and-long situations being a gamechanger for the offense

Definitely was some really good moments there because of that. I thought, again, playing in the pocket, stepping up, stepping up, finding the guys downfield. I thought there were some big-time opportunities there and third downs are hard downs. For us to come away with some really successful plays on that, I thought credit to those guys who are out there making the plays.

On if WR Chris Olave's speed and verticality, offsetting the Rashid Shaheed trade

It's a good question. I think CO [Chris Olave] can attack every element of this field and so we're going to be able to utilize it. He obviously made a phenomenal play downfield a couple of times. A few of the other guys got in there and played some roles. Maybe not as many targets to those guys, but those guys were out there playing and they did an awesome job executing. So we feel like this group is going to grow together and progress.

On what was done to slow down Carolina RB Rico Dowdle

Yeah, team football. Team football on defense, assignment sound, gap sound, tackled really well. We missed some tackles. He broke some tackles there, but I thought we just did such a good job of not giving up those big, explosive long runs as we went.

On this game meaning more to WR Chris Olave after his concussion at this stadium a year ago

I think that's fair to ask CO. Obviously, his experience is -- he's had to navigate that through this entire journey and so obviously you can anticipate that's something that's going to weigh on your mind a little bit. It's natural, but the way he played today, I mean, that was just incredible. Incredible plays, phenomenal. The energy, the juice that he brought to our team, I thought it was a really special performance.

On what he is expecting from Tyler Shough for now and where he wants to see his development grow from here

We're just going to keep growing. Every game there's going to be five plays that we're going to say we're going to want to improve on those. There are going to be some plays we can lean our hat on and continue to reinforce. We just got to keep growing.

On the importance of the eight-minute drive to seal the game

Yeah, that was such a cool drive. Just a really, really cool drive. Physicality, offensive line battling, it was really Taysom (Hill) and the running backs and they just went for it. Really cool drive for those guys. Really an identity-type drive where you can lean on when you talk about being a physical football team and grinding games out like this, that's a really good example of it.

On the decision of the coin toss

Yeah, traditionally, normally we prefer to defer. We're trying to get a little bit of a spark the last few weeks. It didn't get the result that we hoped, so we'll decide each week how we want to best suit this and make that decision before the game.

On how the decision was made on which side to defend

Which direction you're kicking and all that stuff? Yeah, usually that's in communication with special teams and just talking field conditions and stuff. Sometimes there's wind that factors into that.

On the end of the first-half sequence

Yeah, obviously trying to have the last possession of the [half], the last relevant possession of the quarter and so I got to look at it to see. Ultimately, we weren't able to get the points you want. I got to look at seeing where we can improve there. Execution-wise, schematically, get ourselves in position maybe. I'll look at how those timeouts progressed and where we can potentially improve there.

On what the conversions on third downs tell you about Tyler Shough

He's executing and playing really good football. Those are not easy downs. We talked about there are hard downs in this league and teams that can execute in those downs and make plays, they're the ones that are the most successful teams. Credit to our guys who went out there and made those plays, the protection, Tyler, the perimeter guys. Some guys stepped up.

On using the momentum of this win into the bye week and going into the final stretch of the season

Yeah, obviously you won't play for 13 days now. So to have a win as your last moment, I think can carry some momentum, carry some energy. Our guys got to recharge during the bye week. We got to use it to our advantage and put ourselves in position to kind of attack this backend of the season and so I'm excited for our guys to be able to utilize that and get ready to go.

On what was working about the run game

Physicality. [Running back] Alvin [Kamara], credit to him. Some really just physical, dirty runs where he was able to finish really well. I thought there was some progress there and just got to keep growing in that area.

On the energy still being good despite the 1-8 start and it being reinforced with the win

No doubt. Ultimately we are here to win football games and we want to win football games collectively and it takes the entire group. I give a ton of credit to our guys, the way they battled the last few weeks to come up short a number of games in a row. And to come back, recharged, ready to go each Wednesday, ready to put in a new plan and just go about the week every single week the same way and so I think it's credit to our guys. We have the right kind of guys in the building to keep growing and keep developing and keep getting better as a team.

On what he saw on the interception by CB Alontae Taylor?

I didn't get a great angle of it. Obviously big-time play. Just credit to him. Just being in place and having vision on the ball, obviously, big-time play.

On stopping Carolina QB Bryce Young

Yeah, I thought a combination of rush and coverage. When those things tie together and they play complementary and our defense is able to play with a little bit of a lead and a little bit of that momentum and now you can feel like, hey, I can come after this quarterback, I can rush the passer. The DBs can play with a little bit more vision and play in some favorable situations. I think all that stuff adds up to favorable situations for us to go for it.

On the Saints' defense

Yeah, I thought the play style was really good. The physicality, the effort, the finish, to create a couple turnovers was obviously game-changing for us and I thought our guys kept tackling the football. There are more opportunities out there that we're going to look at and say, hey, we're really close here, how can we keep getting better and keep taking advantage of these opportunities.

SAINTS QUARTERBACK TYLER SHOUGH

On this feeling of his first win as a starter

Just a great feeling. I think my favorite moment is just seeing everybody in the locker room dapping everybody up and the work that everyone has put in at this point and just a great team win. CO [WR Chris Olave] hit it, the defense, special teams, everybody had an impact on the game and it was just a great feeling.

On the touchdown play to TE Juwan Johnson at the end

He was the last guy the ball was supposed to go to on that play. Really trying to work the field side there on the high-low with a dig and a shallow and he slipped out and on a scramble drill and it was just a really good play by him finishing it off, so I thought the O-line played really well all day. They're a really good front and we were kind of down with some injuries so some of those guys really stepped up, just [OL] Asim [Richards] and [OL] Dillon [Radunz] so I was really proud of them.

On what was working with the scramble drill today

Yeah, I think the guys, we put a point of emphasis on it in practice and I think guys were just doing a really good job getting open. I think there's a bunch more times where I could have found them, left some stuff on the field there so we'll clean that up and I'll be better.

On how the 52-yard pass play to TE Juwan Johnson was initially supposed to go

Earlier on in the game, once again, I think we were trying to get it to him a little bit and it just happened that way and he just, like I said, he was just familiar. I think just having that chemistry with him, he did a really good job of extending it.

On if he thought about running it himself

Yeah, at that point you're trying to get yards with your legs and you're always trying to make a play down the field with your arm and if you can't get it, then you're going to go run for it. There's kind of a little bit of both to it and he just kind of flashed and did a really good job.

On the mentality on the last touchdown drive

We knew going into the drive that we had to be super focused on our details. We had to finish the drive, we had to get points on the board and whatever that looks like but I was just focused on that play. It just happened that way. It was a great finish and great stamp to it, but at the end of the day what I have been preaching is just do your job and focus on those little things because that's how those big plays come. It's nothing more than it was this week that happened at practice. I don't think he's ever gotten the ball up to that point on that play and just a really good job by him.

On any noticeable areas of improvement from last week to this week

I think just continual reps, continual progression and getting better every single day. Like I said, I think I can continue to get better and be better. We did a really good job running the ball. There was a big emphasis on that, to kind of continue to set that up and I was just really proud of the offense and the whole team. I think just having some urgency each week, having a little bit of juice, a little bit of swagger, it kind of showed up.

On the defensive scheme on the touchdown to WR Chris Olave

Yeah, I saw them spin down late so I knew I had an opportunity. I was thinking it was probably going to be shell but I trust that he was going to go in, especially him down the field. He's such a dynamic player so he did a really good job just kind of fighting through the contact and making the play and finishing it.

On his discussions with WR Chris Olave prior to the game

I think we were just going about the game plan, just the details. I think when you can focus on your task at hand, I think we all have -- there's no telling what people are going through off the field and battling injuries, all that stuff and I think whenever you can come together and just have fun it makes it super easy but super proud of him. I know it wasn't easy for sure, but we were just talking the whole time, texting each other last night about what we were going to do and all that stuff. So I was really happy for him and obviously he had a great day.

On how it felt having his first win as the starting quarterback in the NFL

Yeah, what I said to Catherine was it was a great feeling in the locker room with everybody dancing, you're having fun in there and it just came down to playing complementary football and we play together, great things happen, especially against a good team. For me, it's just been so fun learning every single day each week, kind of the formula for success and obviously, we got to keep competing and keep repeating that.

On how comfortable he has gotten with navigating the pocket and seeing guys down field

Exactly what you said. I think navigating the pocket, keeping your eyes down field and trying to dish it out. There's certain field elements between when you run, scramble, hit the check down but continual progression. I got to continue to be better at it. That's my job. I got to continue to do that. I was really proud of those guys, the O-line, the pocket, I think just our communication, we can continue to be better with it. I think it was a good step and we got a lot more to go.

On the physicality of the run game today

Yeah, that was big-time. [WR] Alvin [Kamara], his explosiveness, the O-line, their physicality against that front, that was unbelievable, especially just to come in there, like I said, banged up, not a lot of reps, so just super happy for them and I think all those guys, [RB] Devin [Neal], everybody, [QB] Taysom [Hill] finishing at the end with the four-minute drive. That wasn't easy so they did a really good job.

On coming off the field on third down or in the red zone for QB Taysom Hill

No, I think he does a really good job presenting just you got to think. I think I can do the same with my legs but he's just a strong runner, man. He's freaking tough and I think that's part of it. Whatever we can do to get the first down and score, that's awesome. Super happy for him and obviously the element that he's added for us.

On the coaches trusting him to finish as opposed to playing conservatively

Yeah I think it's just [Head Coach Kellen [Moore] knew the importance of just finishing that drive and converting there and we're always -- my mindset, I'm always going to be aggressive and always try to go for it. That's kind of Kellen's motto, just go for it. A great play by him, just staying friendly and finishing it.

On the importance of playing complementary football today

It's huge. I think the defense was just the lifeline today of creating that juice. Earlier on I think we did some good things but we had to finish in some of those moments and the defense did a heck of a job. They provided the juice. They were getting stops all over the field. Those turnovers were big and the great thing about our offense, we were able to capitalize on some of that and we got to continue to do

that. We've got to continue to play complementary football.

On finishing

Yeah, that's the best feeling in the world from an offensive perspective. When you put enough points on it and you try to run the ball and you get a great four-minute drive and you finish that out and you get to take a knee, there's not a better feeling from a confidence standpoint, from the O-line, the running backs, all those guys. That's when you can kind of impose your will. We got to continue to find ways to put points on the board and not leave so many plays out there but I was just so happy with how we finished that.

On the touchdown to TE Juwan Johnson

He wasn't supposed to get the ball, really. He was just kind of clearing out, make a backside alert if he got it, but he just did a good job in the scramble phase, slipping them and then making the catch. So stuff like that happens, you got to make a play and more often than not, especially in the red zone, is when those good things happen on the scramble drill.

On when he saw Johnson on the previously mentioned touchdown

Kind of afterwards whenever I stepped and moved left I saw him shake him but obviously I wasn't looking at him prior to that.

On carrying that momentum going into the bye week

I think it's just having a sense of urgency when we are at practice in our preparation and continuing the emphasis on everything we have done to this point, just learning from our mistakes and then just not letting up. There's a lot of ball to be played and I think we got a lot ahead of us.

On being the first Saints rookie quarterback to win a game since 1981 and if that means something to him

I think it was Archie [Manning], right? Or Dave [Wilson]? You guys are on it, man. That's pretty cool. It's a great honor just because of this organization and obviously Archie is one of my closest friends that I have been able to resource and somebody that mentors I look up to, and so that's obviously a great feeling but at the end of the day, we have a lot more to go in the tank. It's a good step, but I think we can continue to progress.

On how he felt playing in Carolina again after having a season-ending injury here last year

It was a tough time. I had a great week of practice, but I didn't really think about it too much. When I came into the stadium, I just felt it all again. I had a lot of anxiety pregame. There's a lot of stuff going on. My close people knew what was going on, so they just stuck by my side, and I appreciate them for all that.

On how his touchdown felt

It felt good, especially felt like we needed a play and we needed some momentum. We drove the ball down on that first drive and we kind of missed on that third down in the red zone, but I felt like we needed some momentum and we took the lead on that play. It was a huge play. [QB] Tyler [Shough] threw a great ball, staying in the pocket, and like I said, it was a great play.

On stepping into a different role as a deep threat after the WR Rashid Shaheed trade

First off, it was tough for me to see [Seahawks WR] Rashid [Shaheed] get traded. He's been here since I've been here, so it was real tough on me all week. I was kind of down about it. We've been through the fire together. It's not the ideal situation, but we stuck by each other. We kept trying to rally each other every week, especially this year. I'm proud of him and the opportunity he has going over there (Seattle). I'm going to go watch him right after this. To answer your question, I felt like we were both being used as that [deep threat], especially this year. We had speed on both sides. He's a route runner too at the end of the day. He's not just a deep threat. That's generational speed right there, so I feel like him being used as a deep threat was great for the team.

On what was working for the defense today

I think we were just putting our eyes in the right place, doing our job and just making sure our technique was right. I think [LB] Demario [Davis] did a really good job with just bringing everybody in after almost every series and just making sure we just did our assignments. I think we did that, and I think it showed up.

On what led to his interception

We do the call all week. [Head] Coach [Kellen Moore] kind of tweaked a few ways that I could kind of disguise the play. I think I kind of made a little bold move of myself going super close to the line of scrimmage, but I knew what my job was, and I just trust everybody around me. Like I said, I knew my assignment, knew my alignment and just made sure my technique was good.

On what changed for him and the defense after the Panthers first touchdown drive

Yeah, I mean I think you go week in and week out. Everybody has their first 15 plays, right, so they are going to throw things at us that we haven't seen on film, things that they kind of practice throughout the week. If you go back to the Rams game, they kind of did the same thing, second series – three and out. We made sure the second series when we had the three and out that we kind of stay true to ourselves. We didn't go haywire, nobody was doing what they wanted to do. We just stayed true to the game plan, and I think, like I said, that's what we did. The first series they kind of threw some twists and turns in there a little bit and we kind of settled down and stayed true to ourselves.

On if it was rewarding to get a win today

I just want to go play ball, good ball every week, regardless of what talks are happening before, what talks are happening after. I think just going out there with this group of guys, like I said, it was so fun today. We had a lot of fun. Just laughing and key-keying on the sideline. We were getting our corrections when we needed them, but I feel like we were on top, and we made sure we stayed on top the whole game.

On his role on the fumble recovery

With the motion rules and things like that, I knew I had to stay tight to the line of scrimmage on the motion. I didn't even know that they were handing the ball off, but I just knew that was who my guys was. As soon as I saw the ball hit the ground, I trusted that everybody was running to the ball, and I just didn't want him to get the ball, so I just hit him. When I looked back, I saw at least two or three white jerseys jumping on the ball. Super excited, and like I said, everybody was doing their job – running out the stack, running to the ball, and when you do that, good things happen.

On how this win felt emotionally

It felt really good. We needed it. I don't care if we are 2-8 now, nobody can tell us, 'Oh you're just 2-8 now.' Doesn't matter. A win is a win. If we lose this game, everybody is talking negatively about us, right? We needed this win and going into the bye week, good momentum. Everybody can heal up if they are bruised or hurting and we can come back and play a good Atlanta team at home. Great way to go into the bye week. We are going to enjoy this one.

PANTHERS HEAD COACH DAVE CANALES

Opening statement

First and foremost, give credit to the Saints for executing a game plan. They came in here. They had a style about how they were going to do it, came up with some big plays, some explosives which is an area we have to make sure we shore up there. Some great one-on-one opportunities, they took advantage of. We turned the ball over twice, they didn't. We were fortunate, got the ball back after the [blocked field goal] and didn't turn that into points right there. That was certainly a big one in the game. Missed opportunities across the board and I just look at it and I got to do a better job. I got to do a better job of making sure we have answers and complements to our run game. They did a fantastic job taking care of that part of it and we hit a couple of passes but not enough. I got to make sure that we put our heads together and game plan so that we have answers for when a team makes it difficult to run the ball.

On why the passing game has struggled to make consistent plays

That's something we're working on. It's just taking advantage of those opportunities one-on-one down the field. It comes down to just me-to-you factor and making plays. At the same time, from a game-plan standpoint, I've got to make sure we're putting our guys in the right spots, taking advantage of matchups.

On what the Saints' receivers did to keep the secondary off balance

They just made their plays. Some phenomenal one-on-one opportunities. Obviously, the long touchdown. [CB] Jaycee [Horn] will be the first one to tell you he can stay up and make that play right there. [WR Chris] Olave made another one-handed grab right in front of our sideline. They came up with a couple of big plays there. Extended on a couple of off-rhythm throws. [QB] Tyler Shough did a great job of extending the play, finding guys down the field. In the extension of it, we have to do a better job containing him there and making sure we stay attached. We did not get that done.

On if he saw offensive player interference on CB Jaycee Horn on WR Chris Olave touchdown catch

I mean, I don't know. I'll have to look at it. I'll have to look at the replay on that one. I think he'd be the first one here to tell you to take responsibility for the one-on-one opportunities. Regardless of what's happening on the other side, we got to make sure we stay on top and make those plays.

On what is holding back the passing game

I think it's just timing and rhythm but also it's the choices. The type of passes, that's something that starts with me, and I got to make sure I look at that and make sure we're putting our guys in the right situations with the match-ups and leverages that we're working with to give them access so that [QB] Bryce [Young] feels confident to throw to the guys in different spots.

On what he saw on the interception

Just a good play by the buzz defender. He ran underneath number one outside. Made a great play on the ball. Bryce would love -- I'm sure he would tell you he'd love to have that one back. It was a really nice play by [CB] Alontae Taylor. Give him credit for that.

On how it felt and the emotions in the locker room post game

Yeah, just frustration because we didn't play our version of football. That was not us. We can't have that. We can't give up big plays. We can't turn the ball over. Offense has to be more opportunistic and take advantage of some of the situations. The defense made some adversity stops for us and got us the ball back over and over in the second half. We didn't come away with anything off of it.

On if he was surprised with the way they handled the offensive and defensive front?

No. This is a team that regardless of their record, they've been playing hard. They got a good group of veteran guys to make it difficult. They have excellent schemes and all that and they put it together today and we didn't take advantage of our plays.

On finding answers in the passing game when the running game is having challenges

That's what we're working on. We have to make sure we take advantage of that, the loaded line of scrimmage. We got a couple plays out there. [We're] just trying to find those right styles for our guys based on what the coverages that they're playing is.

On the growth of OLB Nic Scourton

He's taking great strides. Week-in and week-out, he gets better and he's into it. He's working hard. He's improving, taking to the coaching and applying it to the game so I'm really proud of him for that but there are some technique things, some little stuff that we have to make sure we're really disciplined on. It starts with the run game and certainly with our pass rush and lanes and letting [QB] Tyler [Shough] get out a couple of times to make these plays. We got to do a better job there.

On his thoughts on the missed field goal

A block. I just saw a good push. We knew that about this group. They're a big group, really physical on the inside. They have their best guys out there pushing the guards and doing things and they executed it really to perfection to get the ball down and we hustled to get the ball back once it advanced past the line of scrimmage. They were reviewing that for a while but it was a really well-executed block.

On if he thought the kick was low on the blocked field goal

I don't know. I'll have to look at it again to see if it was lower than normal. I just know that they got a good push and got their hands up.

On what the two turnovers did to morale today

It was frustrating. But we have to go to the next drive and hope that we can get another opportunity to try to turn this game around. In the moment, you just got to go to the next drive. You got to re-focus. As we sit here and look back at it, we're sick about the opportunities that we missed.

On WR Xavier Legette

I think X [WR Xavier Legette] is running fast. He's doing everything we ask of him. I think if you just broaden it out a little bit and look at the full group, we need better execution in general and that starts with me. That starts with myself and making sure that we have the right schemes for our guys.

On what happened on the jet sweep that led to the fumble

Absolutely, it was just a poor exchange and we got to make sure that we're sharper on all those little things.

On his overall assessment of QB Bryce Young today

I think just generally it's our group, making sure that we are advancing our pass game so we can be a balanced offense and making sure that we know, yes, we can run the football but there are going to be days like this where a team is really stout and they play us well, we have to be able to adjust and go to

that next phase of our game and make that come alive.

On his thoughts on how Young is throwing the ball

I think he's throwing the ball great. I think he'll have some plays that he'll tell you that he would like to have back, but in general, this is not about Bryce, this is about me. This is about our group. This is about us taking the steps so we can be a balanced offense.

On if WR Tetairoa McMillan was 100% today

He looked great, yeah. He looked great to me.

On if he feels like the offense is spreading the ball around enough

I think general pass game success will get the ball distributed but we have to find that rhythm and the ball will find guys in different zones, different areas based on where the read goes. We certainly try to make 'TMac' [WR Tetairoa McMillan] an emphasis of what we're doing and that continues to be a part of what we're doing but we count on the other guys to make those plays as well but I think it's collectively where we have to go as a pass game.

On if there was any possibility that the team might have looked past the Saints this week

I certainly hope not. Our approach is to come back to work every week regardless of the opponent. We're in pursuit of our best football. That was not our best today. We did not let the things that we have been successful with come alive today, so we have to make sure that we take the next opponent and look at what they're doing and have that type of mentality. Our mindset has to be to find our best, our best football. It can't depend on who the opponent is and how you respect a bunch of pros and every week they're going to bring a bus full of pros every week and so we have to make sure we're detailed, locked in and get back on track with our work.

On LB Trevin Wallace injury update

Trevin, we're evaluating him for a right shoulder so we'll have more information as the week goes on.

On what is going through his mind after today's loss

I take accountability. I've got to be better. We've got to execute. We got to do better stuff. It's on us. Give credit to that defense. It was a good group. We respect them, but we've got to execute and it starts with me.

On what he thought happened on the interception

On if this loss was harder than others this season

I'm frustrated because we didn't win, we didn't execute. We didn't be the best version of ourselves that we're chasing, that we know we can be and, again, it's not just me. We're all competitors.
