#### **SERIES RECORDS**

- The game's result tied the all-time series at 24-24 between Carolina and New Orleans.

#### **CHRISTIAN McCAFFREY BREAKS FRANCHISE SCRIMMAGE YARDS RECORD**

- On a nine-yard run in the first quarter, Panthers running back Christian McCaffrey broke the franchise record for most scrimmage yards in a single season, previously held by DeAngelo Williams (1,636, 2008). McCaffrey ranks fourth in the NFL with 1,747 scrimmage yards this season.
- McCaffrey recorded his seventh-straight game, ninth this season, with at least 100 scrimmage yards, as he finished with 120 yards (53 rushing, 67 receiving).

#### **McCAFFREY BECOMES FIRST NON-QB WITH A PASSING TD**

- Christian McCaffrey threw a 50-yard touchdown pass to Chris Manhertz on a fourth down in the first quarter.
- McCaffrey became the first non-QB to throw a touchdown pass in franchise history, and the first Panthers player with career rushing, receiving and passing touchdowns.
- McCaffrey became the first player with 50 yards rushing, receiving and passing in a game since Walter Payton achieved it (12/22/85).

#### **LUKE KUECHLY TIES FRANCHISE RECORD IN TACKLES FOR LOSS**

- Luke Kuechly recorded two tackles for loss according to press box stats, bringing him to 19 tackles for loss on the season.
- Kuechly has tied Charles Johnson's 2011 mark for tackles for loss in a season, set in 2011.
- Kuechly ranks third in the NFL in tackles for loss, and has the most by a linebacker in a season since Kansas City's Justin Houston had 23 in 2014.

#### **DONTE JACKSON RETURNS FOR TWO**

- Donte Jackson intercepted a pass on a two-point conversion attempt and returned it the length of the field for a two-point score.
- It marked the first time in franchise history that Carolina has ever returned a PAT or two-point try for two points.

#### **JAMES BRADBERRY CAUSES TWO TURNOVERS**

- James Bradberry was responsible for both of Carolina's takeaways in the game. He recorded his first interception of the season in the second quarter.
- He then forced a fumble with under two minutes remaining that went through the end zone for a Carolina touchback.
