THE MATCHUP

The New Orleans Saints will open their 2019 preseason at 7 on Friday night in the Mercedes-Benz Superdome when they take on the Minnesota Vikings in the first of a four-contest preseason slate.

It will be the 12th time that the Saints have faced the Vikings in the preseason and their first exhibition since a 2001 matchup that was played in San Antonio, Texas. However the regular season and postseason have done enough to keep the juices flowing between New Orleans and Minnesota the past two years. In 2017, a young Saints club traveled to U.S. Bank Stadium, struggling in a 29-19 loss. A much more mature and experienced squad came close to knocking the Vikings off in the NFC Divisional Playoff four months later. On October 28, 2018, the growth of the Saints was evident for all in a 30-20 win at Minnesota on Sunday Night Football.

The Saints are 24-25 in the preseason under Head Coach **Sean Payton** overall, posting a 3-1 mark in 2018, which served as a springboard towards a 13-3 regular season in a campaign that did not end until an overtime loss in the NFC Championship game.

Friday night's preseason opener will be the first time Saints fans can see the team's five-player draft class in game action, with most of them expected to play on offense, defense and special teams. Center **Erik McCoy**, the club's second round draft pick from Texas A&M is currently competing with free agent acquisition **Nick Easton**, a former Viking himself and **Cameron Tom** for the position in the middle. Safeties **C.J. Gardner-Johnson** and **Saquan Hampton**, fourth and sixth round draft choices, have shown the ability to contribute in both the secondary and on coverage units during training camp. A pair of seventh round draft picks in tight end **Alize' Mack** and linebacker

Kaden Elliss have also had their moments in training camp.

It is unclear whether some other of the club's major free agent acquisitions – defensive tackle **Malcom Brown**, tight end **Jared Cook** and running back **Latavius Murray**, a free agent pickup from the Vikings will play, but in the first three weeks in training camp, it has become clear that this trio has shown the abilities to help their respective units and make a significant impact.

At quarterback, **Drew Brees** has typically seen limited action the past several preseasons, however Payton will have the opportunity in addition to preparing Brees for the regular season to get additional game tape and live playing experience for on Brees' two backups **Teddy Bridgewater**, who played for Minnesota from 2014-17 and **Taysom Hill**, who also has the ability to contribute in other phases of the offense as well as on special teams.

Bridgewater and Hill both bring unique skillsets to the position. Bridgewater has taken advantage of his first full off-season with the Saints in 2019 after spending his first four seasons in Minnesota. Hill's versatility on both offense and special teams, has provided him valuable snaps in both phases, while he continues to fully develop as a signal-caller. Both signal-callers have been sharp in leading the offense as well as Brees in practices at the Ochsner Sports Performance Center through the first ten days of training camp.

In addition to the three-way battle at center, there are several other position battles playing out for the Saints in the preseason, including the second wide receiver spot (**Ted Ginn Jr.** and **Tre'Quan Smith**) as well as where the team continues to settle on rotations for the defensive line, the linebacker corps and in the secondary's multiple defensive back packages.

THE COACHES

Saints Head Coach **Sean Payton** has posted a 126-80 overall record (.612), including an 8-6 postseason mark after the franchise had won only one playoff game prior to his arrival. Payton holds both the club's top win total and winning percentage. He continues to represent the Saints as the model of stability not only within the NFC South, as he is the longest tenured head coach within the division, but also among the most accomplished within the NFL. Only the New England Patriots' Bill Belichick (2000) has been with the his team longer. Payton is also one of just seven active coaches to lead a team to a Super Bowl victory. The others are Belichick, the Seattle Seahawks' Pete Carroll, the Oakland Raiders' Jon Gruden (Tampa Bay in 2002), the Baltimore Ravens' John Harbaugh, the Philadelphia Eagles' Doug Pederson and the Pittsburgh Steelers' Mike Tomlin. The 2018 Saints edition posted a 13-3 regular season record, secured the NFC's number one seed for the postseason and advanced to the NFC Championship game. A franchise-record five players were selected to the *Associated Press* All-Pro team and eight were named to the Pro Bowl. New Orleans' ten-game winning streak was the second-longest in club history and the longest streak in the NFL in 2019. The streak only sits behind in club record books, New Orleans' 13-0 start under Payton in 2009, the season when they captured Super Bowl XLIV. Payton earned a bachelor's degree in communications at Eastern Illinois, where as a quarterback he had 10,665 passing yards, at the time the third-highest total in NCAA Division I-AA history. Payton was inducted into the Eastern Illinois Hall of Fame in September of 2000 and had his jersey retired in a ceremony in September of 2010. He received an honorary doctorate from his alma mater in 2013. Payton was born December 29, 1963 in San Mateo, Calif., and raised in Naperville, Ill., Payton has a daughter, Meghan and a son, Connor.

Vikings Head Coach **Mike Zimmer** enters his sixth season at the helm, having put together a 48-34-1 record (regular season and postseason) since 2014. After managing a 7-9 mark in 2014, his first season, Zimmer and QB Teddy Bridgewater used their sophomore seasons to roar to an 11-5 record and the Vikings' first NFC North title since 2009, when they advanced to the NFC Championship Game but fell to the Saints. The 2015 campaign ended with a nailbiter, as the club fell to the Seattle Seahawks, 10-9, in the Wild Card round. Following an 8-8 campaign in 2016, in 2017, Zimmer led the Vikings to a 13-3 record, his second NFC North title as head coach and a first-round playoff bye. The Vikings had an 8-7-1 record in 2018 under Zimmer as they had back-to-back winning records for the first time since the 2008-09 campaigns. Prior to his arrival in Minnesota, Zimmer served as the defensive coordinator for

the Cincinnati Bengals from 2008 to 2013. During that span, Bengals defenses ranked in the top-15 in yards allowed each year and on two occasions ranked in the top-five. He served briefly as defensive coordinator for Atlanta in 2007 after having held that position with the Cowboys from 2000 to 2006. He originally entered the NFL in 1994 as a defensive assistant with the Cowboys, was promoted to defensive backs coach in 1995, and was to defensive coordinator in 2000. Zimmer was the defensive coordinator for Washington State between 1989 and 1993. During his final season with the Cougars, the team ranked eighth nationwide in total defense and second in rushing defense, allowing only 298.8 total yards per game and only 86.3 rushing yards per game. Before joining Washington State, Zimmer was the defensive coordinator for Weber State from 1983 to 1988, prior to which he was an assistant coach there for two seasons. Zimmer began his coaching career in 1979 at the University of Missouri as an assistant coach after graduating from Illinois State.

SERIES HISTORY

Minnesota leads the regular season series, having won 19 of 30 contests since the teams first met on October 13, 1968 at Tulane Stadium and three of four postseason meetings; the Black and Gold won that first matchup 20-17. The Saints would not beat the Vikings again until Sept. 3, 1978, losing six straight contests in the interim. Though the Vikings have a firm grasp of the overall series record, the Saints have fared much better since the 2006 arrival of **Sean Payton** as head coach and the free agent signing of QB **Drew Brees**. The teams have met on seven occasions since then, five times in the regular season and twice in the postseason and New Orleans has captured four. The Saints and Vikings have met four times in the playoffs, including the Black and Gold's first ever postseason game in 1987, which the Vikings seized at the Superdome, 44-10. The third playoff meeting proved to be the charm, however, as the two clubs met at the Superdome on Jan. 24, 2010 for the NFC Championship. Brees completed 17-of-31 passes for 197 yards and three touchdown throws with RB **Pierre Thomas** scoring two touchdowns and RB **Reggie Bush** and WR **Devery Henderson** adding scoring grabs. A late interception of Minnesota QB **Brett Favre** by CB **Tracy Porter** sent the game to overtime, and the Saints won, 31-28, off a 40-yard field goal from K **Garrett Hartley**, sending the Saints to Super Bowl XLIV.

In the preseason, the Saints lead the all-time series 7-4 with contests having been played in four different locations (Canton, Ohio, Minnesota, New Orleans and San Antonio, Texas).

Vikings center/guard **Nick Easton** played for the Vikings from 2015-18. New Orleans cornerback/punt returner **Marcus Sherels** prepped at John Marshall (Rochester, Minn.) HS, was a four-year letterman at the University of Minnesota and played for the Vikings from 2010-18...Saints Secondary Coach **Aaron Glenn** played for Zimmer from 2005-06, when Zimmer served as defensive coordinator of the Cowboys...New Orleans cornerback **Kayvon Webster** played for Minnesota Assistant Head Coach/Offensive Advisor **Gary Kubiak** in Denver when he served as head coach of the Broncos from 2015-16...Minnesota wide receiver **Laquon Treadwell** played at the University of Mississippi...Vikings Linebackers Coach **Adam Zimmer** served on the Saints coaching staff from 2006-09...New Orleans fullback **Zach Line** was originally signed by Minnesota as an undrafted free agent in 2013 and spent his first four NFL seasons with the Vikings before originally signing with the Saints in training camp in 2017 training camp...New Orleans defensive end **Cameron Jordan** was born in Minneapolis while his father Steve, who was a seventh round draft pick of Minnesota in 1982 out of Brown, played tight end for the Vikings from 1982-1994. Steve was a three-time All-Pro, six-time Pro Bowl selection from 1986-91, for whom he played his entire career, finishing with totals of 498 receptions for 6,307 yards and 28 touchdowns and was named one of the 50 greatest Vikings of all-time. He will go into the Vikings Ring of Honor this season...New Orleans quarterback **Teddy Bridgewater** was Minnesota's first round draft pick in 2014 (32nd overall), where he was Pepsi NFL Rookie of the year that season and served as the Vikings starting signal-caller from 2014-15, earning a Pro Bowl berth his second season. After suffering a devastating knee injury in practice at the end of the 2016 preseason that required surgery, Bridgewater was voted by his teammates as the club's Ed Block Courage Award winner that season and returned to action on the field in 2017...Minnesota defensive end **Ade Aruna** played at Tulane University...New Orleans linebacker **A.J. Klein** and wide receiver **Ted Ginn Jr.** played with Vikings cornerback **Bene Bewikere** in Carolina...Minnesota College Scout/Regional **Pat Roberts** previously served as the head strength coach and offensive line coach at Millsaps College in Jackson, Mississippi...Vikings Assistant Strength and Conditioning Coach **Derik Keyes** is a Laurel, Miss. native who played at Louisiana-Lafayette and had coaching stints at his both alma mater and the University of South Alabama and served on the same Cleveland Browns coaching staff with Glenn from 2014-

15...Vikings tackle **Rashod Hill** played at the University of Southern Mississippi with Saints center **Cameron Tom...** New Orleans cornerback **P.J. Williams** was in the same secondary with Minnesota cornerback **Xavier Rhodes** in 2012 for the Seminoles and was later teammates with Vikings running back **Dalvin Cook** during the 2014 campaign. Saints offensive lineman **Derrick Kelly** also blocked for Cook with the Seminoles...New Orleans tight end **Dan Arnold** prepped at Shanley Catholic (Fargo, N.D.) High School as a senior, where he eclipsed 1,000 yards receiving...Vikings defensive ends **Tashawn Bower** and **Danielle Hunter** both played at Louisiana State University...New Orleans defensive tackle **Ziggy Hood** and Minnesota quarterback **Kirk Cousins** were teammates with the Washington Redskins from 2016-17...Vikings tight end **Irv Smith Jr.** prepped at Brother Martin (New Orleans) HS and his father, Irv Smith Sr. was a first round draft pick of the Saints in 1993 and played in New Orleans from 1993-97...Saints safety **Vonn Bell**, wide receiver **Michael Thomas**, cornerback **Marshon Lattimore** all played at Ohio State with Vikings center **Pat Eflein**...New Orleans Assistant Wide Receivers Coach **Ronald Curry** and Vikings Head Strength and Conditioning Coach **Mark Uyeymama** served on the same coaching staff with the San Francisco 49ers in 2015...New Orleans guard **Larry Warford**, Minnesota running back **Ameer Abdullah** and tackle **Riley Reiff** were teammates with the Detroit Lions...Saints wide receiver **Lil' Jordan Humphrey** and Vikings cornerbacks **Kris Boyd** and **Holton Hill** were teammates at the University of Texas. Humphrey was coached by Vikings Offensive Assistant **Christian Jones** with the Longhorns in 2018...New Orleans Assistant Special Teams Coach **Phil Galiano** and Minnesota Assistant Offensive Line Coach **Andrew Janocko** served on the same coaching staff at Rutgers in 2011...New Orleans tight end **Alize' Mack** and Minnesota linebacker **Martini Greer** were teammates at Notre Dame...Saints tight end **Jared Cook** caught passes from Vikings quarterback **Sean Mannion** with the St. Louis Rams in 2015...New Orleans cornerback **T.J. Green** and Minnesota cornerback **Mackensie Alexander** were college teammates at Clemson.

TEAM NOTES

FAMILY TIES

Numerous Saints players, coaches and administrators are not the only members of their families to make a name for themselves in pro football. No fewer than 18 Saints players, coaches or front office personnel have relatives who have played, coached or served in the front office in the NFL.

Defensive Coordinator Dennis Allen - Father, Grady, played linebacker for the Atlanta Falcons from 1968-72.

Offensive Coordinator Pete Carmichael - Father, Pete, served as an assistant coach in the NFL from 1994-2003 with the Jacksonville Jaguars and the Chicago Bears.

Quarterbacks Coach Joe Lombardi - The grandson of legendary NFL head coach Vince Lombardi, who led both the Green Bay Packers and Washington Redskins. He led the Packers to three straight and five overall NFL Championships in seven years, in addition to winning the first two Super Bowls.

Secondary Coach Aaron Glenn - Younger brother, Jason, was a linebacker and sixth-round draft pick of the Detroit Lions in the 2001 NFL Draft, playing six seasons in the NFL with the Jets, Dolphins and Vikings.

Linebackers Coach Mike Nolan - Father, Dick, played safety in the NFL for nine years before becoming a coach. He led the San Francisco 49ers from 1968 to 1975 and was the head coach of the Saints from 1978 to 1980.

Offensive Assistant D.J. Williams - Father, Doug Williams, is Washington's senior vice president of player personnel, who won Super Bowl XXII as the starting quarterback for the Redskins, the pinnacle of a storied 12-year professional football career.

Asst. GM/College Scouting Dir. Jeff Ireland— Stepson of Chiefs Hall of Fame LB/C E.J. Holub and the grandson of former Eagles RB and Bears personnel exec. Jim Parmer.

DE Mario Edwards Jr. - Father, Mario Edwards Sr., played five NFL seasons at cornerback for the Dallas Cowboys (2000-03) and Tampa Bay Buccaneers (2004).

LB Kaden Ellis - Father, Luther, was a 12-year NFL veteran for Detroit and Denver, who was a two-time Pro Bowl selection for Detroit.

DE Cameron Jordan - Father, Steve, had a 13-year career as a tight end with the Minnesota Vikings, with six Pro Bowl selections.

T/G Marshall Newhouse - Cousin, the late Robert Newhouse, played fullback for the Dallas Cowboys.

T/G Andrus Peat - Father, Todd, played six NFL seasons with the Phoenix Cardinals and the Los Angeles Raiders.

WR Michael Thomas - Uncle, Keyshawn Johnson, is a former wide receiver, spending 11 seasons in the NFL with the Jets, Buccaneers, Cowboys and Panthers, earning three Pro Bowls and the Super Bowl XXXVII title.

Area Scout Scott Campbell - Father, Marion was former head coach of the Atlanta Falcons.

Scouting Assistant Matt Phillips - Father, Ted is the president/CEO of the Chicago Bears.

COACHES IN THE NFL

Seven members of the 2019 Saints coaching staff have prior playing experience in the National Football League

Head Coach **Sean Payton** - Played for the Bears in 1987.

Asst. Head Coach/Tight Ends **Dan Campbell** - A third round draft pick (79th overall) of the Giants in 1999 out of Texas A&M, who went on to appear in 114 games with 75 starts for New York, Dallas and Detroit, where he caught 91 passes for 934 yards and 11 touchdowns.

Wide Receivers Coach **Ronald Curry** - Curry was a seventh round draft pick (235th overall) of Oakland in 2002 out of North Carolina and played for the Raiders for seven seasons, appearing in 76 games with 32 starts and registering 193 receptions for 2,347 yards with 13 TDs.

Secondary Coach **Aaron Glenn** - The 12th overall pick of

the Jets in 1994 out of Texas A&M and started 176 of 205 games with New York, Houston, Dallas, Jacksonville and New Orleans and was a three-time Pro Bowl selection. Recorded 41 interceptions with six brought back for TDs.

Defensive Assistant **Leigh Torrence**— Enjoyed a seven-year career with Atlanta, Washington and New Orleans.

Special Teams Asst. **Michael Wilhoite** - Played six seasons (2012-17) with the 49ers and Seahawks. Played in 79 career games with 45 starts and posted totals of 316 tackles, four interceptions, nine passes defended, two forced fumbles, a fumble recovery and 40 special teams stops.

Pass Rush Specialist **Brian Young** - Young played in the NFL from 2000-08 with the St. Louis Rams for his first four seasons, who originally selected him in the fifth round of the 2000 NFL Draft (139th overall) out of UTEP and for his final five with the Saints, appearing in 124 career games and recording 22.5 sacks and eight fumble recoveries.

ROSTER ROLL CALL

Of the 90 players currently on the Saints' roster, 49 were on the active roster, a reserve list or the practice squad at the end of the 2018 season. TEAM NOTES

QUARTERBACKS (3) - Returners: Drew Brees, Teddy Bridgewater, Taysom Hill. **WORTH NOTING:** Brees enjoyed another prolific season in 2018 en route to his 12th Pro Bowl selection, 11th as a Saint. He completed 364-of-489 passes (NFL-record 74.4%) for 3,992 yards with 32 touchdowns and a career-high and NFL-best 115.7 passer rating, as he became the NFL's all-time completions and passing yardage leader. Bridgewater and Hill are competing in training camp for snaps behind Brees. Bridgewater, a five-year NFL veteran, has appeared in 35 career games with 29 starts and returns to New Orleans for the second consecutive season after he served as Brees' backup in 2018 and started the regular season finale. Now in his third NFL season, in addition to his quarterback duties, Hill has evolved into a threat in other facets of the offense and on special teams. His role expanded further in both phases in 2018, as he played in all 16 games and carried 37 times for 196 yards with two touchdowns, caught five passes, completed three-of-seven throws for 64 yards, returned 14 kick-offs for 348 yards (24.9 avg.), posted six special teams stops and blocked a punt.

RUNNING BACKS (8) - Returners: TB Alvin Kamara, FB Zach Line, TB Alvin Kamara, Dwayne Washington. **Veteran additions:** FB Michael Burton (UFA-Chi.), TB Matthew Dayes (FA), TB Latavius Murray (UFA-Min.), TB Jacquizz Rodgers (UFA-TB). **Undrafted rookies:** TB Devine Ozigbo. **Departures from 2018:** TB Mark Ingram. **WORTH NOTING:** A point of emphasis in training camp for New Orleans is to continue to maintain and improve a running game that averaged 126.6 yards per game to rank sixth in the NFL, while retaining its strength as a pass-catching unit. The Saints running attack is led by the duo of Kamara and Murray. Kamara, who recorded 194 carries for 883 yards and a franchise-record 14 touchdowns to lead the team in rushing, was also a threat in the passing game with 81 grabs for 709 yards and four touchdowns, as he led the team with 1,592 total yards from scrimmage and was selected to his second Pro Bowl. Following the departure of Ingram in free agency, New Orleans signed Murray, who carried 140 times for 578 yards (4.1 avg.) with six touchdowns in his final season in Minnesota. Cadet averaged 26.6 yards on nine kickoff returns and will audition for a role handling both kickoff and punt returns as well as an extended role on offense. Washington handled lead back duties in the regular season finale and rushed for 108 yards. Line is a 6-3, 233 pound bruising blocker who returns for his third season. He excelled in short yardage situations,

carrying nine times for 41 yards (4.6 avg.) and catching two touchdowns..

WIDE RECEIVERS (12) - Returners: Tre'Quan Smith, Michael Thomas, Travin Dural, Simmie Cobbs Jr., Keith Kirkwood, Ted Ginn Jr., Austin Carr. **Veteran additions:** Cyril Grayson Jr., Rishard Matthews (UFA-NYJ). **Undrafted rookies:** Deonte Harris (FA), Emmanuel Butler (FA), Lil'Jordan Humphrey (FA). **Departures from 2018:** TommyLee Lewis, Cameron Meredith. **WORTH NOTING:** Competition from top to bottom of the wide receiver corps has been a constant in training camp. The group is once again led by fourth-year veteran Thomas. In 2018, he led the league in receiving with a franchise-record 125 receptions for 1,405 yards with nine touchdowns. Ginn returns for his third year with the Black and Gold, healthy after missing the bulk of last season with a knee injury. His ability to stretch the field will serve the Saints well. Smith enjoyed an impressive rookie season, posting 28 receptions for 427 yards (15.3 avg.) and five touchdowns. Kirkwood showed flashes of brilliance as a rookie in the second half of the season, grabbing 16 passes for 185 yards and two touchdowns in the regular season and adding another postseason scoring catch. After missing 2018 with a season-ending knee injury in training camp, Dural will look to compete for a roster spot. Butler has been a surprisingly reliable option in the passing game in training camp as he fights for a roster spot. He will continue to work to show his ability to get open in the preseason, as he Smith, Dural, Cobbs, Kirkwood and Carr compete for spots in the club's multiple receiver sets.

The ten-year NFL veteran posted career-highs in receiving (68), receiving yardage (896) and receiving touchdowns as he was selected to his first Pro Bowl. Hill, a six-year NFL veteran will serve as a solid complement to Cook, recording 16 receptions for 185 yards and one touchdown. Overall in his career, he has posted 83 grabs for 799 yards and 11 touchdowns. Mack and Powell come to New Orleans as rookies from the Power Five (Mack-Notre Dame) and a small school background (Powell-Monmouth) and both will also compete for snaps along with Griffin and Arnold, who made significant development in 2018.

Eli Apple joined New Orleans in a midseason trade from the Giants and he finished the season with two interceptions and two fumble recoveries. Fifth-year player Williams solid coverage and tackling abilities also put him in play to see significant snaps. Green, Crawley, Webster and Williams will all receive ample opportunities in the secondary and on special teams in training camp and the preseason contests. Vonn Bell and Marcus Williams will hold the two starting safety positions, with Gardner-Johnson and Hampton also playing a significant role on both defense and special teams. The hard-hitting Bell, the club's second round draft pick in 2016, enjoyed a standout third campaign.
