**THE MATCHUP**

The New Orleans Saints (7-9) enter Sunday's season finale having won three consecutive games, looking to end a campaign having won their last four games for the first time since the 2011 season, when they host the Carolina Panthers (6-10). New Orleans will be looking to end the season with their first four-game winning streak since the 2020 season, which could serve as a springboard for the 2023 campaign.

Since a Week 14 bye when they stood at 4-9, the Saints have managed three consecutive victories, where they remained in playoff contention through Sunday, when they defeated the Philadelphia Eagles, 20-10 at Lincoln Financial Field.

The formula for New Orleans' resurgence has varied little over the last month, since the Saints dropped a 17-16 decision at Tampa Bay on December 5. New Orleans has averaged 138.7 yards per game on the ground, while surrendering only 12.7 points per game, the third lowest total in the league.

The story line has varied little week-to-week and on Sunday at Philadelphia (13-3) was no exception, as the Saints defeated an opponent that finished with 13 or more regular season victories for the second consecutive season away from the Caesars Superdome.

Quarterback **Andy Dalton** was a model of efficiency, completing 18-of-22 passes (81.8%) for 204 yards, including a 58-yard completion to rookie wideout **Rashid Shaheed**. Shaheed let New Orleans in receiving with six receptions for 79 yards. In the run game, running back **Alvin Kamara** had a game-high 16 carries for 74 yards. Tight end **Taysom Hill** affected all facets offensively, rushing for 46 yards and one touchdown, completing two-of-two passes for 24 yards and catching a pass for a nine-yard gain.

New Orleans surrendered 20 points or fewer for the seventh consecutive contest and also scored their first defensive touchdown of the season, as cornerback **Marshon Lattimore** returned to action and returned an interception 12 yards into the end zone. The Saints tied a season-high with six sacks, three from defensive end **Cameron Jordan**, who became the franchise's all-time takedown leader (115.5).

Special teams also played an important part in field position. Five of **Blake Gillikin's** six punts landed inside-the-20-yard line to help the Saints win the field position battle, while kicker **Wil Lutz** booted both field goal attempts.

**Around the NFC South:** The Atlanta Falcons (6-10) host the Tampa Bay Buccaneers (8-8) at Mercedes-Benz Stadium at noon CT.

**LAST MEETING**

**Panthers 22, Saints 14; September 25, 2022 @ Bank of America Stadium** – The Saints have identified their biggest enemy and unfortunately it hasn't been any of the three opponents they've faced so far in 2022.

In a 22-14 loss to Carolina at Bank of America Stadium in Charlotte, which dropped the Saints' record to 1-2 as they prepare for next week's game against Minnesota in London, New Orleans again did things that are difficult to overcome for teams in search of victory.

They don't have to be reminded of it. The examples were sprinkled through all three units against the Panthers.

New Orleans failed to score until the fourth quarter. On New Orleans' second possession of the first quarter, Panthers OLB **Frankie Luvu** stripped the ball from Saints RB **Alvin Kamara** and it was picked up by DE **Marques Haynes Sr.** 44 yards for a touchdown.

New Orleans still struggled offensively through the second quarter, as they were forced to punt two more times, victimized by penalties on each possession. But after Panthers K **Eddy Piniero** made a 48-yard field goal, New Orleans moved the ball to the Panthers 11-yard line, where QB **Jameis Winston** connected with rookie WR **Chris Olave** on a 49-yard completion. However Panthers DE **Henry Anderson** blocked a 30-yard field goal attempt and the Panthers held a 13-0 halftime lead

New Orleans opened the third quarter with a 14-play,

drive where New Orleans advanced to the Carolina 30-yard line, but K **Wil Lutz** missed a 48-yard field goal attempt. The Saints finally responded on a possession that spanned the third and fourth quarters as Winston led the team on a 10-play, 89-yard drive capped off by a five-yard **Mark Ingram II** touchdown run.

On the second play of Carolina's ensuing possession, QB **Baker Mayfield** connected with Panthers WR **Laviska Shenault Jr.** on a short pass that turned into a 67-yard touchdown that gave the Panthers a 19-7 edge with 12:06 left in the fourth quarter.

**NEW ORLEANS SAINTS-CAROLINA  
PANTHERS SERIES HISTORY**

The Panthers initially entered the National Football League as an expansion franchise in 1995 and since then, with New Orleans leading the regular season series 28-27, with the Saints picking up the 2017 NFC Wild Card showdown at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome. The clubs were in the NFC West from 1995-2001 and the rivalry has continued in the NFC South since it was formed in 2002 divisional realignment. The Saints have a 14-12 record in games played in the Caesars Superdome against the Panthers. Of the 55 regular season games in the series, 27 have been decided by eight points or less, with New Orleans winning 14. The Saints' longest winning streak was a five-game stretch from 2000-02.

In the 55 regular season games of the series there has been:

- 1,214 points scored by New Orleans, 1,186 allowed.
- A five-game New Orleans winning streak from 2000-02.
- A four-game New Orleans winning streak in games played at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome from 1998-2001 and a four-game winning streak at contests played at Bank of America Stadium from 2017-20. The Saints will try to extend their winning streak at Caesars Superdome contests on Sunday to four.
- 27 games decided by double-digits.
- Seven games decided by 21 or more points.
- 27 games decided by eight points or less.
- One 32-point win by New Orleans in the 2020 regular season finale.
- A 32-point loss by New Orleans.

Finished with nine carries for career-high 112 yards and career-high three rushing touchdowns, including a 60-yard score in the fourth quarter. Recovered a blocked punt in the second quarter than led to his second rushing touchdown. First career game with three rushing touchdowns. Completed his lone pass for a 21-yard touchdown. Sunday's contest against Seattle was Hill's first career game with 3+ touchdowns. He's also the first player since the NFL merger to register a kick return, two rushing touchdowns and a passing touchdown in the same game. Hill became the second player in franchise history with at least three rushing touchdowns and a passing touchdown in the same game, joining Archie Manning. Hill's the third player ever to record at least 100 rushing yards, three rushing touchdowns and a touchdown pass in a single game, joining **RONNIE BROWN** (September 21, 2008) and Pro Football Hall of Famer **LADAINIAN TOMLINSON** (September 25, 2005). Hill now has 21 career rushing touchdowns, seven career touchdown receptions and nine career touchdown passes. He joins Tomlinson as the only players since 2000 with at least 20 rushing touchdowns, five receiving touchdowns and five touchdown passes in their career. With his 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> career rushing touchdown, Hill joins Walter Payton as only the second player in the Super Bowl era with 20 rushing touchdowns (21), eight passing touch-

downs (nine) and six receiving touchdowns (seven). Named NFC Offensive Player of the Week, joining RB Reggie Bush as only the second Saint to win a conference weekly award in multiple phases, having previously won NFC Special Teams Player of the Week (Week 14, 2018).

### NEW ORLEANS SAINTS MAN OF THE YEAR: LB DEMARIO DAVIS

2022 team winner and team nominee for Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year for dedication to the community and charitable endeavors and excellent play on the field.

Davis was selected to the Pro Bowl for the first time in his career, as he leads New Orleans in both tackles (94) and sacks (6.5) with one interception, five passes defended and a fumble recovery.

## TEAM NOTES

### CLOSING STRONG

Finishing the season strong has been an important theme for the New Orleans Saints in first years. Winners of their last three contests, the Saints will seek to finish their season having won their last four games for the first time since 2011. The Saints have also won their last three regular season finales. If they win on Sunday, they will have captured their last four regular season finales for the first time since they did so each season from 1987-95.

### BABY IT'S COLD OUTSIDE

With the December 24 temperature at Cleveland's FirstEnergy Stadium at six degrees Fahrenheit at kickoff, New Orleans' matchup in Cleveland was the coldest starting temperature for a game in franchise history. Previously the lowest starting temperature for a Black and Gold contest was 24 degrees in a 37-26 loss to the Philadelphia Eagles on December 26, 1993 in Veterans Stadium. In a game, where the starting wind chill was -16 in a stadium draped over Lake Erie, New Orleans persevered in the elements and came back from a 10-0 deficit to prevail with a 17-10 victory. In recognition of the challenges faced organizationally, starting with the team to need to compress their practice schedule to travel on December 22, two days ahead of the Christmas Eve contest to arrive prior to a blizzard on December 23, Saints head coach Dennis Allen awarded the New Orleans equipment staff with a game ball for their efforts and forward thinking in outfitting the team for challenging conditions. .

**Offensive Assistant D.J. Williams** - Father, Doug, is a veteran of Washington's front office, who won Super Bowl XXII as their starting quarterback, the pinnacle of a storied 12-year pro football career, which includes him being in the Buccaneers Ring of Honor, also working in the Tampa Bay

front office.

**Vice President/Assistant General Manager-College Personnel Jeff Ireland** – Stepson of Kansas City Chiefs Hall of Fame linebacker/center E.J. Holub. Grandson of Eagles running back and Bears personnel exec. Jim Parmer.

**National Scout Terry Wooden** - Brother, JoJo, is Director of Player Personnel for the Los Angeles Chargers.

**LB Demario Davis** - Late cousin Steve McNair was a former standout quarterback for the Houston Oilers/Tennessee Titans (1995-2005) and Ravens (2006-07).

### BUCKING THE ODDS

The Saints have a long tradition of finding players as free agents signed after the draft that make an impact. Several currently on the 53-man roster play key roles on offense, defense and special teams.

Wide receiver/return specialist **Rashid Shaheed** came to New Orleans as one of the all-time best Division FCS returners and after spending the first five weeks on the practice squad, made a quick impact, Oct. 16 vs. Cincinnati with a 44-yard rushing touchdown. He followed that up with a 53-yard touchdown reception on Oct. 20 at Arizona to become the only Saint to score a touchdown in each of his first two offensive touches. In the December 18 win over Atlanta, he finished with three receptions for 95 yards, with a 68-yard touchdown grab from Taysom Hill, the longest play from scrimmage of the season for New Orleans and the fifth-longest receiving TD by a Saints rookie all-time. On the Christmas Eve win at Cleveland in challenging conditions, Shaheed led the team in receiving with four grabs for 41 yards. In the January 1 victory at Philadelphia, he led the team in receiving for the third consecutive week, posting six receptions for 79 yards, including a 58-yard grab to set up a field goal. Overall, he has carried for three times for 50 yards with a 44-yard touchdown, caught 25 passes for 454 yards (18.2 avg.) with two TDs, returned 20 punts for 193 yards (9.7 avg.) and returned 14 kickoffs for 320 yards (22.9 avg.).

Wide receiver **Marquez Callaway** led the team in 2021 in two of four major receiving categories with a club-best 46 receptions for a team-high 698 yards (15.2 avg., ranked tenth in the National Football League) and a club-best six touchdown grabs as the team's only offensive skill player to play in all 17 games. In 2022, Callaway has 16 grabs for 158 yards with one touchdown and has returned four punts for 25 yards.

Defensive end **Carl Granderson** played in 15 games in 2021 with three starts and posted 24 tackles and three sacks. In 2022, he has posted 49 stops (28 solo) and a career-high 5.5 sacks, recovering the first fumble of his career on December 5 at Tampa Bay. In the Christmas

Eve win at Cleveland, Granderson, sacked Browns QB Deshaun Watson at the Saints 22-yard line on fourth down with 19 seconds left in the fourth quarter to secure the win. The following week on Jan. 1 at Philadelphia, he posted two stops, 1.5 sacks, one stop for loss and two quarterback hits, as Granderson has posted at least half a takedown in three consecutive weeks for the first time in his career.

Punter **Blake Gillikin** enjoyed an October, 2021 where he was selected as NFC Special Teams Player of the Month. He finished his first season in 2021 with punting duties ranked third in the league with 29 punts dropped inside the 20-yard line. In 2022, he has a 41.6 net average with a club-record 30 dropped inside the 20. His performances in outdoor conditions the past two weeks, have helped New Orleans win the field position battle in victories. Gillikin had a successful afternoon in challenging conditions on Christmas Eve at Cleveland, when he punted six times for 254 yards with a 42.3 gross punting average, a 26.5 net and dropped two inside-the-20 in a contest where field position was tantamount. On Sunday at Philadelphia, a career-high five of Gillikin's six punts fell inside the 20.

Defensive back **J.T. Gray** led the National Football League with 19 special teams stops (league-best 16 solo) in 2021, was voted by his teammates as the club's special teams captain and was selected to the Pro Bowl as a starter and as a first-team *Associated Press* All Pro. In 2022, he leads the team with 11 coverage stops (six solo), despite missing three games with a hamstring injury. In Sunday's win at Philadelphia, Gray recorded a tackle and also flipped a punt to linebacker Pete Werner before it reached the end zone to be downed at the Eagles four-yard line.

Tight end **Juwan Johnson** led his position group with four touchdown receptions in 2021, converting to the position after playing in college and starting his Black and Gold career in 2020 as a wideout. In 2022, he leads his position group in receiving with 41 grabs for 587 yards with a club-best and career-high seven receiving touchdowns, ranked third at the position in the National Football League. On Sunday at Philadelphia, Johnson tied his career-high in receiving with five grabs for 62 yards.

A converted quarterback from college who ended up playing both safety and linebacker at Utah, **Chase Hansen** was originally signed by New Orleans as a free agent after the 2019 NFL Draft. After splitting the bulk of the 2021 season between the practice squad and the active roster where he recorded one special teams tackle in three games, Hansen has recorded a career-high five special teams stops in ten contests in 2022, as well as posting three defensive tackles in his first career start along with a coverage stop.

Offensive Lineman **Calvin Throckmorton** was one of two Saints linemen to play in all 17 games in his second season in 2021, starting four at right guard and the last nine contests at left guard. In 2022, he's played in 14 games with six starts, three at left guard and three at right guard.

Defensive tackle **Shy Tuttle** joined the club in 2019 as an undrafted free agent and has played in 62 regular season games with 32 starts, posting 140 tackles, four sacks, one interception, 11 passes defended, one forced fumble and one recovery for one of the league's top run defenses. In 2021, Tuttle played in all 17 games with 15 starts and finished with a career-high 48 tackles, three passes defended, one forced fumble and a fumble recovery in the season finale at Atlanta. In 2022, through 16 games, Tuttle leads the defensive tackles with 44 tackles, two sacks and four passes defended as he approaches his career-high for stops.

In 88 career games with 63 starts for the Cardinals (2015-19), Houston Texans (2020-21) and Saints (2022), Johnson has carried 1,007 times for 4,071 yards (4.0 avg.) with 39 touchdowns and has caught 275 passes for 2,777 yards with 18 touchdowns.

Originally a third round draft pick of the Denver Broncos in 2018 out of Boston College, cornerback **Isaac Yiadom** has appeared in 69 games with 20 starts for five teams and has recorded 107 tackles, one interception, 12 passes defended, one forced fumble and 17 special teams stops. After joining the team's practice squad around midseason, Yiadom, was activated in late November and has buttressed the team's coverage units with two stops, while appearing on multiple core units.

### EVANS FIRST-YEAR SEMIFINALIST FOR PRO FOOTBALL HALL

Former New Orleans Saints right guard Jahri Evans is one of five first-year eligible nominees among 28 Modern-Era Player Semifinalists for the Pro Football Hall of Fame's Class of 2023. Originally selected by New Orleans in the fourth round of the 2006 NFL Draft out of Division II Bloomsburg, Evans arrived in New Orleans and captured right guard duties in training camp. For his Black and Gold career, Evans started all 169 regular season games and ten postseason contests that he appeared in at right guard, finishing his career opening 14 contests at Green Bay in 2017. He was a five-time *Associated Press* All-Pro selection and was selected to six consecutive Pro Bowls from 2009-14. A 2010's selection to the All-Decade team, Evan's four first-team All-Pro selections are double that of any other player in Saints history.

### PRACTICE MAKES PERFECT

A spot on the practice squad is another avenue to eventually get onto the active roster and have the opportunity to contribute. Below is an overview of players on the club's roster with extensive practice squad experience.

Running back **Dwayne Washington** participated on the Saints practice squad briefly in 2018 after spending most of the 2016 and 2017 seasons on Detroit's active roster. Through development, the tailback, in addition to his running skills, has developed into a core special teams player with 11 stops.

Tight end **Juwan Johnson** was signed by New Orleans out of Oregon, where he spent his graduate transfer season following the 2020 NFL Draft as a wideout. Recording four receptions for 39 yards seven contests, Johnson spent the majority of the season on the practice squad. Converted to tight end in 2021 and leading the position group with four touchdowns, Johnson's took advantage of his frame and participation in his first full offseason strength and conditioning program in 2022 and leads the tight ends group with 41 receptions for 487 yards with a club-best seven touchdown grabs, third in the league at his position.

After spending the last six weeks of the 2019 season and the first 16 weeks of the 2020 campaign on the practice squad, Linebacker **Andrew Dowell** was elevated to the club's active roster for the regular season finale at Carolina. In two preseason games in 2021, he posted five tackles, one forced fumbles and two coverage spots to secure a regular season roster spot. In Week 3 at New England, Dowell recorded the first blocked punt that an opponent had against the Patriots since the 2015 season. Dowell's five special teams tackles on Dec. 19 at Tampa Bay was the highest single-game total in the NFL in 2021 and he finished the season tied for fifth in the league with 14 coverage stops. On Oct. 16 vs. Cincinnati, he forced a fumble

on punt coverage and he posted a tackle at Arizona on October 20. Dowell has had three stops in the last two game to end his season in a flurry.

After splitting his rookie season in 2018 between the practice squad and active roster, defensive back **J.T. Gray** enjoyed a breakthrough campaign in 2019, when he was selected *AP* second-team All-Pro when he recorded 16 special teams tackles, one blocked punt and one coverage fumble recovery. In 2021, he was selected as a first-team All-Pro and to his first career Pro Bowl (starter), when he led the NFL with 19 special teams tackles (league-leading 16 solo). Gray leads the team with 11 special teams stops in 2022, despite missing three games with a hamstring injury.

Wide receiver/return specialist **Rashid Shaheed** came to New Orleans as one of the all-time best Division I-AA returners and after spending the first five weeks on the practice squad, made a quick impact on Oct. 16 vs. Cincinnati with a 44-yard rushing TD. With his 53-yard receiving touchdown on October 20 at Arizona, Shaheed become the only Saint to score touchdowns on each of his first two career offensive touches. Shaheed has also handled return duties for New Orleans since being activated, bringing back 20 punts for 193 yards (9.7 avg.).

Originally signing as an undrafted free agent with Kansas City in 2014 out of BYU, safety **Daniel Sorensen** spent the first half of his rookie season on the Chiefs practice squad before being elevated to the active roster at midseason where he contributed with seven tackles. Sorensen has played in 122 games with 42 starts, posting 391 tackles, 4.5 sacks, 13 interceptions, four returned for touchdowns, 35 passes defensed, four forced fumbles, three fumble recoveries, 36 coverage stops, one special teams fumble recovery and one blocked field goal. Sorensen has seven defensive tackles and seven special teams stops in 2022, with his most important play taking place in the Christmas Eve win over Cleveland with his third quarter 36-yard interception return.

Fullback **Adam Prentice** was originally signed by Denver following the 2021 NFL Draft out of South Carolina. Joining the Saints at the conclusion of the 2021 preseason, Prentice appeared in seven games with three starts for New Orleans, carrying three times for five yards and catching three passes for 16 yards, while making one special teams stop. In 2022, he has played in nine games with one start, rushing four times for nine yards, catching three passes for nine yards and also contributing on special teams with one tackle.

Ahead is a synopsis of several returning players and newcomers through the draft and free agency to the 2022 Saints offensive line:

**Tackle/Guard James Hurst** - An eight-year National Football League veteran who was signed as a free agent from Baltimore in 2020, Hurst has 134 career regular season appearances with 79 starts at three different positions on the inside and outside. His versatility came in handy in 2020, as he started two contests at left tackle and one at left guard and the Saints gained over 200 yards rushing each time. In 2021, Hurst moved into the lineup for eight games at left tackle in place of an injured Armstead, two at left guard in place of an injured Andrus Peat and three at right tackle for an injured Ryan Ramczyk, starting contests at three different positions. Hurst has started 15 games at left tackle in 2022.

**Right Tackle Ryan Ramczyk** - The Black and Gold used their second first round selection in the 2017 NFL Draft to snag Ramczyk out of the University of Wisconsin, one of the best offensive linemen in the entire draft. After opening all 16 games and both postseason contests in 2017 and being selected as a PFWA All-Rookie, he has been selected as an *Associated Press* All-Pro selection three times since. After missing seven contests in 2021, Ramczyk has rebounded to be the only member of the line to open every game in 2022, also having been elected as a team captain for the first time.

**T/G Andrus Peat** - A first round selection (13th overall) in the 2015 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Peat was considered one of the top college linemen in 2014. In his first eight seasons, he's played in 91 regular season games with 86 starts, opening a contest at every position except center. In 2020, he opened 13 contests at left guard as he was part of the NFC Pro squad for the third consecutive season. In 2021, he opened the first six contests, where New Orleans

got off to a 4-2 start before suffering a season-ending pec-toral injury. In his return to the starting lineup in the 2022 season opener in Atlanta, New Orleans rushed for 151 yards. In back-to-back weeks, Peat was been a part rushing efforts of 200-yards plus by the club for the first time since 2020.

**Center/Guard Erik McCoy** - New Orleans traded up in the second round of the 2019 NFL Draft to select this standout from Texas A&M, who was a three-year starter, anchoring the middle of the Aggies line. In 2018, he was a team captain who paved the way for the SEC's leading rusher and in 2019 was the first Saint in franchise history to start at center in Week One, opening all 16 regular season contests. McCoy opened all 16 contests and both postseason games in 2020 for the NFL's sixth-ranked rushing offense. McCoy started 13 contests at center in 2021. Prior to the Week One season opener at Atlanta, McCoy agreed to a five-year contract extension with the Saints.

**Tackle Landon Young** - A mainstay at left tackle for his entire college career at the Kentucky, Young played in 49 contests with 30 starts in his college career. The Lexington, Ky. native was selected by New Orleans in the sixth round of the 2021 NFL Draft and held up to the competition in training camp to snare a roster spot. Young opened one contest at right tackle in 2021 and serves as Ramczyk's backup on the right side, also playing jumbo tight end. On October 13 at Pittsburgh, he slide over to left tackle for the second half to replace Hurst (concussion) and opened this the November 20 win over the Rams at one of the league's most challenging positions. In Sunday's win at Philadelphia, Young played the final three quarters in place of Ramczyk (hip).

**Offensive Lineman Calvin Throckmorton** - This 6-5, 309 pound former four-year starter on the Oregon line was signed as an undrafted free agent in 2020, possessing the flexibility to play all five positions along the offensive line. After spending his rookie season on the practice squad, Throckmorton increased strength in the 2021 offseason and made strides in training camp. In his NFL debut in the 2021 season opening-win, Throckmorton was called to play right guard following a lower leg injury to McCoy in the first quarter, subsequently starting four contests. He then moved into left guard, Oct. 25 at Seattle following a shoulder injury to Andrus Peat and opened the last ten, opening three in 2022 in place of an injured Peat and starting the Week 13, 16 and 17 contests at right guard.

**Offensive Lineman Lewis Kidd** - This 6-5, 311 pounder closed out his college career with 48 consecutive starts at Montana State, third in school history. Possessing the versatility to play both guard and tackle, he was selected a consensus first-team All-American in the fall of 2021. Kidd was the only Saints undrafted free agent rookie to secure a roster spot in Week One of the regular season and made his first career NFL start, opening at left guard on November 13 at Pittsburgh.

**Left Tackle Trevor Penning**- The club's second first round draft choice (19th overall) in 2022 out of Northern Iowa, the 6-7, 322-pound Penning competed with Hurst for the starting left tackle slot in the preseason before suffering a toe injury. The Clear Lake, Iowa native brings athleticism and extensive college experience to the tackle position, where he played in 37 games with 33 starts. Activated for the second half of the season, Penning has served as the club's sixth offensive lineman in jumbo packages.

## DEFENSIVE NOTES

### DEFENSIVE DRAFTS

Over the last eight drafts from 2015-22, the New Orleans Saints have shown a commitment to building up the team's defense, spending 21-of-33 picks on that side of the ball. With nine picks in 2015, the Saints picked six defensive players, the most taken since New Orleans chose nine in a 12-round selection meeting in 1990. Below is an overview of the defensive players on the 53-man roster selected from 2015-22 with the club:

**CB Paulson Adebo, Stanford (D3-21)** - Selected in the third round (76th overall) of the 2021 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Adebo finished his college career playing in 22 games with 21 starts and recording 97 tackles, 34 passes defended and eight interceptions, earning All-Pac-12 in 2018 and 2019. He started in the opener and became the first Saint to record an interception in his National Football League debut since 2002. With three picks, he became only the fifth Saints rookie to reach that level. Overall, he posted 63 tackles (54 solo), three picks and eight passes defended. After missing the first two contests of 2022 with an ankle injury, Adebo has posted 59 tackles (46 solo) and seven passes defended.

**DE Marcus Davenport, Texas-San Antonio (D1-18)** - Davenport joined the Saints with the 14th overall pick in the 2018 NFL Draft after showing potential and production as a pass rusher at Texas-San Antonio. In four seasons, Davenport

posted 22 sacks, including 8.5 in 2017 when he captured Conference USA Defensive Player of the Year. Davenport's strength on the line is a valuable asset for the Saints front, as he finished second on the team with a career-high nine sacks and added a club-best three forced fumbles and a fumble recovery in 11 games with nine starts in 2021, despite missing six games. In 13 contests in 2022, Davenport has posted 26 stops and a split sack.

**LB Kaden Elliss, Idaho (D7-19)** - New Orleans selected this four-year starter from Idaho to compete at both linebacker and contribute on special teams. The Salt Lake City native finished his college career with 288 stops 47 tackles for loss and 17 sacks. After missing the bulk of his rookie year with a knee injury, Elliss showed promise with five stops on coverage units in 2020 and in 2021, his progress continued with 13 stops, one sack, one fumble recovery and one special teams tackle. In 2022, Elliss has posted a career-high 71 defensive tackles (42 solo), a career-best seven sacks, second on the team, two passes defended, two forced fumbles and four special teams stops. Elliss led the team with 35 stops in the month of November and has followed that up with 24 stops and 2.5 sacks in four December/January contests.

**CB Marshon Lattimore, Ohio State (D1a-17)** - The 11th overall selection in the 2017 NFL draft out of Ohio State possesses all the traits of a lockdown defender. With his agile, fluid style, Lattimore has the ability to shut down the best wide receivers. In 2017, he finished with 53 stops, five picks, to lead NFL rookies and the Saints, tying a team rookie record, a club-best 18 passes defended, a forced fumble and a recovery. Lattimore was the first Saints corner selected to the Pro Bowl since 1995 and selected as AP Defensive Rookie of the Year. In 2021, he reached the Pro Bowl for the fourth time, finishing with 68 tackles, three picks, a career-high and league-best 19 passes defended and a fumble recovery to lead the team with four takeaways. The Saints immediately welcomed the return of Lattimore to the starting lineup on Sunday at Philadelphia, when he returned an interception 12 yards in to the end zone to give New Orleans their first defensive touchdown of the season.

**DT David Onyemata, Manitoba (D4-16)** - Possessing a unique combination of size and speed, this Nigeria native had an impressive rookie year after becoming the first player from the University of Manitoba to be drafted into the NFL. Despite being new to football, the 2016 fourth round draft pick has become a critical member on the interior of the Saints defensive front in 2017, playing in 105 regular season contests with 67 starts, posting 256 career stops, 22 sacks for a loss of 145.5 yards, one interception, six passes defended, one forced fumble and two fumble recoveries. For the first time in his career, Onyemata has recorded sacks in three consecutive contests in 2022 in three straight weeks, as he has anchored the middle of the line with 40 tackles (23 solo), four takedowns, a pass defense and a fumble recovery. **CONTINUED ON NEXT PAGE**

## DEFENSIVE NOTES

**CB Alontae Taylor, Tennessee (D2-22)** - A four-year starter at the University of Tennessee, this 6-foot, 193-pound defender possesses a combination of speed, instincts and versatility needed to excel on defense and special teams. After playing quarterback in high school and starting his college career at wide receiver, he took to the secondary quickly, finishing with totals of 162 tackles, a split sack, five stops for loss, three forced fumbles, one fumble recovery for a touchdown, four interceptions, one returned 56 yards for a touchdown, 17 passes defended and a blocked punt. Taylor's played an extensive role on defense and his 11 passes defended lead the team to go with 43 tackles (36 solo).

**DE Payton Turner, Houston (D1-21)** - Selected 28th overall in the 2021 NFL Draft, the Texas native comes off a senior campaign where he posted 10.5 tackles for loss and five sacks in only five contests. During four college seasons, Turner notched totals of 115 tackles, ten sacks, 25 tackles for loss, one interception, a forced fumble, ten passes defended and a blocked punt. After having his rookie campaign cut short by a shoulder injury, Turner came back strong in the 2022 season opener at Atlanta with his blocked field goal on the last play of the game securing a dramatic come-from behind 27-26 victory for New Orleans. Oct. 30 vs. Las Vegas, he had his first multiple sack game.

**LB Pete Werner, Ohio State (D2-21)** - New Orleans selected this three-year starter from Ohio State to compete at linebacker. The Indianapolis native finished his college career playing in 47 games with 35 starts, recording 185 tackles, 16 stops for loss, four sacks, 11 passes defended, four forced fumbles and two recoveries. Werner helped power the Buckeyes to the College Football Playoff championship game as a senior in 2020, when he was voted by Big Ten coaches as a first-team All-Conference selection and a Butkus Award semifinalist, posting 54 tackles, 2.5 stops for loss, one sack and two forced fumbles. After a rookie campaign with 59 tackles, in 2022, Werner, currently is third on the team with 77 stops (54 solo), two forced fumbles, two passes defended and a coverage tackle despite missing five contests with injuries.

**DB P.J. Williams, Florida State (D3b-15)** - Williams' career was initially limited by missing all but two games his first two seasons, but he's become an integral member of the secondary. An experienced starter from Florida State, who developed into one of the nation's top cover corners, Williams has developed the ability to play any position in the secondary. He finished tied for the team lead with three picks in 2021 and added 42 tackles (36 solo), two sacks, four passes defended and one forced fumble, playing in 16 games with four starts. In 2022, Williams has played multiple positions and has 21 stops and two passes defended.

A converted quarterback from college who ended up playing both safety and linebacker at Utah, Hansen was originally signed by New Orleans as a free agent in 2019 NFL Draft. After splitting the bulk of 2021 between the practice squad and the active roster where he recorded one special teams tackle in three games, Hansen's found a home in coverage and has recorded a career-high five special teams stops in ten contests in 2022.

After spending the bulk of 2019 and 2020 on the Saints practice squad, Dowell recorded his first career blocked punt on Sept. 26, 2021 at New England. He ranked second on the team with 14 stops and was tied for fifth in the National Football League after having a career-high five tackles (four solo) Dec. 19 at Tampa Bay, the highest single-game total in the NFL in 2021. Oct. 16 vs. Cincinnati, Dowell posted a tackle and a forced fumble, recovered to set up a touchdown. Dowell has three stops in the last two games for six on the season. **CONTINUED ON NEXT PAGE**

Sorensen's a ninth-year NFL veteran who signed with New Orleans as an unrestricted free agent from Kansas City, where he spent his first eight NFL seasons, posting 29 coverage stops, one special teams fumble recovery and one blocked field goal to go with 391 defensive tackles, 4.5 sacks, 13 interceptions, 35 passes defended, four forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries. Sorensen has seven coverage tackles in 2022 for New Orleans, making a big impact in both phases on Dec. 24 at Cleveland, recording a special teams stop and returning an interception 36 yards.

A seventh round draft pick of the Green Bay Packers in 2019 out of TCU, Summers has posted 27 stops on coverage units in his NFL career. After recording 21 tackles in his first three seasons with the Packers, Summers posted four stops in three contests for Jacksonville in 2022 and after being signed off their practice squad last week by New Orleans, led the team with two tackles in his Saints debut on Dec. 24 in Cleveland.

Signed by the Saints after the 2018 NFL Draft out of Mississippi State, Gray enjoyed a banner campaign in 2021. Voted by teammates as the club's special teams captain for the first time, Gray led the NFL with 19 tackles in 16 games, as he was selected as a Pro Bowl starter and as the team's only first-team AP All-Pro. Playing in 64 career games, Gray has career totals of 55 special teams stops, one blocked punt, three fumble recoveries and eight defensive tackles, 1.5 sacks and one pass defended, first on the team with 11 coverage stops in 2022.

Washington, originally a seventh round draft pick of the Detroit Lions in 2016, since being promoted to the Saints active roster from the practice squad at the start of the 2018 season, the former University of Washington stand-out has become a core special teamer for New Orleans. Washington has recorded 15 stops, deflected a punt and recovered a blocked punt, posting a career-best seven stops in 2021. Pressed into tailback duty as well, Washington has 11 carries for 38 yards and one seven-yard reception in 2022.

A third round draft pick of the Denver Broncos in 2018 out of Boston College, in addition to starting 20 of his 69 career contests on defense and posting 107 tackles, a split sack, one interception, 12 passes defended and a forced fumble, Yiadom has recorded 17 career coverage stops for five teams. Brought up to the active roster during Gray's injury, Yiadom has brought a boost to the Saints coverage units with two stops, remaining an integral part of the group after Gray's return to the lineup.

### WIL LUTZ

Kicker **Wil Lutz** went undrafted in 2016, joining the Ravens for training camp. Prior to the start of the regular season, Lutz joined the Black and Gold. Lutz has kicked in 96 games, converting 165-of-193 field goal attempts (85.5 percent) and 285-of-292 PATs (97.6 percent). He's recorded 363 touchbacks, the fifth-most in the NFL since 2016 despite missing the 2021 campaign with an abdominal injury. His 85.3 percent field goal percentage is best among kickers in team history. Until the 2018 regular season finale, he'd kicked a field goal in a club-record 36 consecutive games, second-longest streak in NFL history. In scoring three points on December 6, 2020 at Atlanta to reach 101, Lutz joined Pro Football Hall of Famer Morten Andersen (1985-89) as only the second Saint to score at least 100 points in five consecutive seasons, Lutz doing it in the first five years of his career. Lutz returned to the field with an immediate impact in the season-opening win at Atlanta on Sept. 11, drilling a 51-yard game winning field goal through the uprights with 19 seconds remaining to help secure a 27-26 victory for the Saints. In the past 11 contests, Lutz has drilled 60-, 56- and 54-yard kicks, while making 19-of-22 field goals overall, including his last six.

## QUARTERBACKS

### ANDY DALTON

- Dalton brings significant starting experience to the New Orleans Saints quarterback room. Originally a second round draft pick in the 2015 NFL Draft by the Cincinnati Bengals out of TCU, Dalton has played in 165 career games with 161 starts for Cincinnati (2011-19), Dallas (2020), Chicago (2021) and New Orleans this season and has completed 3,359-of-5,371 passes (62.5 pct.) for 37,978 yards, 243 touchdowns, 144 interceptions and an 87.6 passer rating. Dalton also has 467 career carries for 1,463 yards with 22 touchdowns.

• In 13 starts in 2022, Dalton has completed 237-of-353 passes (career-high 67.1%) for 2,699 yards with 17 touchdowns, nine interceptions and a 95.3 passer rating, ranked ninth in the NFL in completion percentage. Since Week Seven, Dalton has ranked third in the league in completion percentage (69.4%) and ninth in passer rating (98.4).

- Dalton received the starting nod in place of an injured Winston on October 2 against Minnesota in London and completed 20-of-28 passes (71.4%) for 236 yards with one touchdown, zero interceptions and a 108.6 passer rating.

- Dalton helped snap a three-game losing streak for New Orleans on Oct. 9 against Seattle, as he completed 16-of-24 passes for 187 yards with one touchdown, as he helped engineer a fourth quarter 39-32 come-from-behind win.

- Dalton rebounded from three second quarter interceptions to complete 30-of-47 passes (63.8%) for 361 yards with four touchdowns vs. Arizona on Oct. 20. It was the highest single-game passing yardage total by a Saints quarterback since Drew Brees passed for 373 yards against the Cardinals in the Superdome on Oct. 27, 2019.

- Dalton was a model of efficiency in a 24-0 shutout victory over Las Vegas on Oct. 30, when he completed 22-of-30 passes for 229 yards with two touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 117.2 passer rating.

- In the Nov. 20th, 27-20 win over the Los Angeles Rams at the Caesars Superdome, Dalton completed 21-of-25 passes (career-high 84.0%) for 260 yards, three touchdowns, zero interceptions and a career-high 149.6 passer rating. It was the highest passer rating by a quarterback in 2022.

- On Dec. 5 at Tampa Bay, Dalton completed 20-of-28 passes (71.4%) for 229 yards with one touchdown, zero interceptions and a 107.6 passer rating.

- In the Dec. 18, 21-18 win over Atlanta, Dalton completed 11-of-17 passes (64.7%) for 151 yards with two touchdown passes to TE Juwan Johnson, zero interceptions and a 132.2 passer rating.

- On Dec. 24, at Cleveland in challenging weather conditions, Dalton quarterbacked the Saints to a 17-10 victory, completing 8-of-15 passes for 92 yards with five of his completions going for first downs and avoiding any sacks. Dalton improved his record against the Browns to 13-5, his 13 victories the most against any opponent.

- On Jan. 1, at Philadelphia, Dalton completed his first 13 passes for the first time in his career and completed 18-of-22 passes for 204 yards, including a 58-yard throw to rookie wideout Rashid Shaheed to improve his record as a starter against the Eagles to 4-0 in the 20-10 win.

### JAMEIS WINSTON

- The 2013 Heisman Trophy winner at Florida State and the first pick in the 2015 NFL Draft, Winston has appeared in 86 games with 80 starts, completing 1,738-of-2,835 passes (61.3%) for 21,840 yards with 139 touchdowns, 96 interceptions and an 87.7 rating, adding 1,220 rushing yards and 11 touchdowns. In 2021, before suffering a season-ending knee injury in Week Eight, Winston completed 95-of-161 passes for 1,170 yards, 14 touchdowns, three interceptions and a 102.8 passer rating, ranked first in the NFL at the time of his injury in touchdown percentage (8.7).

- In three contests in 2022, Winston has completed 73-of-115 passes for 858 yards with four touchdowns, five interceptions and a 79.5 passer rating.

## POWERFUL STARTS

• Winston improved his record in season-opening starts to 4-2 and became only the third Saints quarterback to win his first two season-opening starts as a member of the Black and Gold. Winston completed 21-of-30 passes for 269 yards and two touchdowns for 213 yards, two touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 111.0 passer rating in the 27-26 win over Atlanta on Sept. 11.

• In the 2021 season opener vs. Green Bay played in Jacksonville, Fla., Winston had one of the most impressive first starts in a Black and Gold uniform amongst its signal-callers. He passed for 148 yards on 14-of-20 passing (70.0%) with a 130.8 rating. Winston threw five touchdown passes. His five touchdown passes tied a career-high. He also finished with 37 rushing yards on six attempts. In his first start with the Saints, Winston became the third player since 1950 to throw for five touchdowns in his first start with a team. Winston's 148 passing yards is the fewest yards with five passing touchdowns since 1948. With zero interceptions, Winston became the first quarterback in NFL history to throw five touchdown passes with no interceptions in his first career start with a new team in an opener. Overall, Winston became the seventh quarterback with five touchdowns and no interceptions in an opener, and first since Baltimore's Lamar Jackson did so at Miami on Sept. 8, 2019. Winston became the 33rd player to start a game at quarterback for New Orleans, and the 11th to win in his first start. It was Winston's first career win over Green Bay.

## COMEBACK KID

• In the September 11 come-from-behind victory over Atlanta, Winston engineered the Saints from a 16-point fourth quarter deficit for the first time in franchise history. In leading two touchdown drives and the game-winning field goal drive, he completed 13-of-16 passes (81.3 percent) for 213 yards with two touchdowns and a perfect 158.3 passer rating in the final period of the contest. It was the 13th fourth quarter/overtime comeback of Winston's career. New Orleans came from 16 points behind in the fourth quarter for the victory for the first time in franchise history, the 209th time, they were 16 points or more behind in a fourth quarter.

## SECOND THROUGH FIVE

In his first five National Football League seasons, Jameis Winston threw for 19,737 yards, the second-most yards ever by a player from their rookie season through their fifth season.

Kamara finished first in the NFL in yards per carry.

• Kamara was the first Saints offensive rookie selected to the Pro Bowl since Rueben Mayes (1986), as an AP second team All-Pro (flex), the clubs' first rookie All-Pro since

1993. He was named *The Sporting News* NFL Rookie of the Year and AP NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year.

In 2020, Kamara carried 187 times for a club-best and career-high 932 yards (5.0 avg.) with a franchise-record 16 TDs, becoming the second Saint to reach double-digits in rushing scores in two seasons. He caught a team-high 83 passes for a club-best 756 yards and five TDs, leading the team in rushing, receiving and receiving yardage.

## WIDE RECEIVERS

### CHRIS OLAVE

• A talented wide receiver who became one of the most prolific receivers in Buckeyes history, Olave played in 47 games and caught 176 passes for 2,711 yards (15.4 avg.) with 35 touchdowns. Olave's 35 career touchdown receptions set an Ohio State program record and ranks fourth in Big Ten history. His 11 career 100-yard games also ranks second in school history. Olave entered the starting lineup in 2019 with immediate results. He helped lead the Buckeyes to three consecutive Big Ten championships (2018-2020) and back-to-back College Football Playoff appearances (2019, 2020). In the 2020 CFP Semifinal vs. Clemson, Olave had a career night, hauling in six passes for 132 yards and two touchdowns in a 49-28 win, securing a bid to play in the championship game. Olave will look to integrate into the Saints offense in training camp after a standout senior campaign, where he caught 65 passes for 936 yards (14.4 avg.) and 13 touchdowns, tied for sixth nationally, as he was selected as an AFCA first-team All-American and a consensus second-team All-American.

• Following a September, where he captured NFL Offensive Rookie of the Month honors with 17 grabs for a league rookie-best 268 yards, followed by scoring receiving touchdowns in back to back contests, Olave leads the team in receiving, yards per catch and receiving yardage with 67 grabs for 982 yards (14.7 avg.) with three touchdowns along with a successful two-point conversion. He leads all NFL rookies in third down receptions (26), tied for seventh in the league and is ranked second among rookies in receptions and receiving yardage.

### 1,000 CLUB

With a club-best 982 receiving yards in 2022, Olave needs 18 yards on Sunday vs. Carolina to join wide receivers Michael Thomas (1,137-2016) and Marques Colston (1,038-2006) as only the third Saint with 1,000 yards receiving yards in his rookie season.

A converted high school quarterback, the Michigan native moved to tight end as a freshman developed into one of the top offensive player in NCAA FCS football, where he played in 44 games, recording 178 receptions for 2,295 yards (12.9 avg.) and 31 touchdowns.

• Though 16 contests in 2020, Trautman posted 15 receptions for 171 yards with one touchdown while also impressively developing his blocking ability.

• In 2021, Trautman continued progress in both blocking and pass-catching, leading the tight end unit with 27 grabs for 263 yards and two touchdowns.

• In 2022, despite being sidelined by an ankle injury for two contests, he has recorded 17 grabs for 189 yards and one touchdown, while adding a fumble recovery on special teams.

## TRIPLE TROUBLE

The New Orleans tight end trio of Trautman, Taysom Hill and Johnson have combined for 17 total touchdowns, with Hill (seven rushing and two receiving) and Johnson (seven receiving), ranked first and second overall. The 17 total touchdowns produced by the position group are tied for the most for a tight ends group in the NFL in 2022. In Saints club record books, the production of 17 touchdowns among the group is tied for second in club record books. With one touchdown Sunday, the group would have the second-highest total by a Saints tight ends group and with two would tie for the most.

### TAYSOM HILL

• Hill's brought unheralded versatility to the Saints offense and special teams. A constant participant on special teams from midseason in 2017 to midseason in 2020, as well as the backup signal-caller and as a runner and receiver, in 2018, Hill averaged 24.9 yards per return on 14 kickoff returns, had six coverage stops, second on the team, completed a ten-yard pass on a fake punt and blocked a punt. Overall, Hill carried 37 times for 196 yards (5.3 avg.), third on the team, with two touchdowns and completed three of seven passes for 64 yards. The blocked punt that sparked a division-clinching win at Tampa Bay, earning him Week 14 NFC Special Teams Player of the Week honors. In the postseason, he caught a touchdown, made a special teams tackle and executed a successful fake punt, making significant contributions in all facets as the team advanced to the NFC Championship game for the third time in franchise history.

• In 2019, Hill carried 27 times for 156 yards (5.8 avg.) with

a touchdown, catching 19 passes for 234 yards with six TDs, deflecting a punt and posting two coverage stops. He ranked third on the club in touchdowns and third in receiving TDs. After a multi-threat performance Thanksgiving night at Atlanta, when he deflected a punt and caught and rushed for a touchdown. Hill became the first quarterback to rush for and catch a touchdown in the same contest since Jim McMahon (1983). In a valiant postseason effort vs. Minnesota, Hill led the team in rushing with four carries for 50 yards, caught two passes for 25 yards with a TD and completed a 50-yard pass.

• In 2020, Hill contributed on multiple facets, completing 88-of-121 passes (72.7%) for 928 yards with a 98.8 rating, rushing 87 times for 457 (5.3 avg.) yards with eight touchdowns, catching eight passes for 98 yards with a TD and playing on special teams units until Brees' rib injury. Following Brees' injury, November 15, Hill went 3-1 in four starts.

• In 12 games with nine starts in 2021, providing value at quarterback on offense and special teams, he completed 78-of-134 passes for 978 yards with four touchdowns, carried 70 times for 374 yards (5.3 avg.) with a club-best five touchdowns, caught four passes for 52 yards and added a special teams stop.

• In 2022, Hill has assisted the Black and Gold offense in multiple facets. Making his debut in that role, he contributed on both offense and special teams in the season opener at Atlanta, Hill carried four times for a club-best 81 yards (20.3 avg.), including a career-long 57-yard carry, as well as an 11-yard rushing touchdown on the same first quarter drive of his long run. Hill also caught a pass for a two-yard gain and contributed on multiple special teams units both on the coverage and return teams. Overall, he ranks second on the team in rushing with 91 carries for a career-high 551 yards (club-best 6.1 avg.) with a club-best seven rushing touchdowns, eight catches for 75 yards with two scores, leading the team in total touchdowns and tied for second in the NFL among tight ends, while completing 13-of-19 passes for 240 yards with two touchdown throws and a 146.3 passer rating. With one more touchdown, he would set a personal career-high and join Jimmy Graham (2011, 2013, 2014) as only the second Saints tight end to reach the end zone ten times.

**RECORD BREAKER**

In the October 9 39-22 win over Seattle, Hill put together one of the most impressive combined efforts by a Saint on both offense and special teams. Hill carried nine times for a career-high 112 yards (club-record 12.4 avg.) with a career-high three touchdowns, including a career-long 60-yard rushing touchdown in the fourth quarter. In addition, he tossed a 22-yard touchdown pass to Trautman and returned three kickoffs to tie a career-high for a career-best 69 yards. He's also the first player since the NFL merger to register a kick return, two rushing touchdowns and a passing touchdown in the same game. Hill became the second player in franchise history with at least three rushing touchdowns and a passing touchdown in the same game, joining Archie Manning (at Chicago, 10/2/77). Hill's the third player ever to record at least 100 rushing yards, three rushing touchdowns and a touchdown pass in a single game, joining Ronnie Brown (September 21, 2008) and Pro Football Hall of Famer LaDainian Tomlinson (September 25, 2005). Hill now has 21 career rushing touchdowns, seven career touchdown receptions and nine career touchdown passes. He joins Tomlinson as the only players since 2000 with at least 20 rushing touchdowns, five receiving touchdowns and five touchdown passes in their career.

**DOUBLE DIGITS**

In the December 18 21-18 win over Atlanta, Hill played a pivotal role in both the running game and the passing game, rushing seven times for 30 yards to contribute to a 134-yard day on the ground for New Orleans and completing two passes for 80 yards, including a 68-yard touchdown to rookie wideout Rashid Shaheed. With Hill's touchdown pass, he now has ten career passing touchdowns, 21 career rushing touchdowns and 11 receiving touchdowns (regular season and playoffs combined). The last player to reach double-digit touchdowns in passing, rushing and receiving was Pro Football Hall of Famer Frank Gifford (1952-64).

**DEFENSIVE LINE****CAMERON JORDAN**

•New Orleans' first choice in the 2011 NFL Draft (24th overall) out of California, Jordan's enjoyed another standout season in 2022, recording 59 tackles, a club-best 8.5 sacks for a loss of 67.5 yards, a team-high 11 stops for loss and 14 quarterback hits, two passes defended and two forced fumbles to tie for the team lead. With three sacks Sunday at Philadelphia, Jordan's now ranked first on the club's all-time sack list (115.5) and 23rd on the NFL's list. He has headlined the only defense in the NFL to rank both in the top three in run defense and sacks over that period.

## MULTI-SACK GAMES

**FOUR IN A ROW**

Jordan has had three consecutive contests of at least one sack in 2013, 2014, 2016, 2017-19 and 2021-22. With at least one sack in the final four contests of 2021, Jordan did so twice in a season for the first time. **LINEBACKERS****DEMARIO DAVIS**

• This dependable and sure-tackling defender joined the New Orleans Saints in 2018 after spending his first six National Football League seasons with the New York Jets and Cleveland Browns. For his career, the Brandon, Miss. native has appeared in 176 career regular season games with 162 starts for the Jets (2012-15, 2017), Cleveland (2016) and the Saints (2018-), recording 1,206 stops (783 solo), 36 sacks, three interceptions, 51 passes defended, three forced fumbles, seven fumble recoveries and 24 special teams tackles. With a club-best seven stops on Sunday at Philadelphia, Davis joined Bobby Wagner and Lavonte David as only the third active NFL player with 1,200 stops.

• In 2018, Davis opened all 16 contests and led the team with 110 stops (74 solo), five sacks to lead the linebackers, four passes defended, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. Davis' abilities to diagnose and tackle played a key role in New Orleans ranking second in the NFL in opponent rushing yards per game and opponent rushing yards per play. Participating in the postseason for the first time, Davis led the defense with 22 stops (15 solo), an interception in the NFC Championship and a pass defense. In 2019, he posted 111 stops, ranked first on the club, four sacks, one interception and 11 passes defended to help spur the league's fourth-ranked run defense.

• New Orleans selected this three-year starter from Ohio State in the second round of the 2021 NFL Draft. The Indianapolis native finished his college career playing in 47 career games with 35 starts, recording 185 tackles (111 solo), 16 stops for loss, four sacks, 11 passes defended, four forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Werner helped power the Buckeyes to the College Football Playoff championship game as a senior in 2020, when he was voted by Big Ten coaches as a first-team All-Conference selection and a Butkus Award semifinalist, posting 54 tackles, 2.5 stops for loss, one sack and two forced fumbles. Werner made his second career start Oct. 3 vs. the Giants and recorded a ten tackles. With 13 stops in Week Five at Washington, he became the first Saints rookie defender to reach double-digit totals in back-to-back games. He ranked fifth on the team with 59 tackles.

• Werner is enjoying a standout 2022 season, starting all 11 games he has appeared at weakside linebacker and ranked third on the team and second at the linebacker position, despite missing four games, with 77 tackles (55 solo), one stop for loss, two passes defended, two forced fumbles and one special teams tackle.

• A seventh round draft pick of the Saints in 2019 out of Idaho, through hard work in the weight room, classroom and practice fields, Kaden Elliss has developed into an integral part of the 2022 New Orleans defense. • This versatile, hard-hitting, playmaking safety and New Orleans native returned home, signing after the draft and brings extensive experience to the secondary. Mathieu was selected by the Arizona Cardinals in the third round (69th overall) in the 2013 NFL Draft out of LSU and has played for the Cardinals (2013-17), Houston Texans (2018) and Kansas City Chiefs (2019-21). In nine NFL seasons, he has played in 145 regular season games with 136 starts and has posted career totals of 688 tackles (579 solo), 42 stops for loss, ten sacks for a loss of 78 yards, 28 interceptions for 338 returns yards, three brought back for touchdowns, 89 passes defended, four forced fumbles, seven fumble recoveries and five special teams stops. Mathieu has been selected to three Pro Bowls, three *Associated Press* All-Pro teams and the Pro Football Hall of Fame's 2010's All-Decade Team.

## NOSE FOR THE BALL

Saints safety Tyrann Mathieu comes to New Orleans after starting all 16 games he played in for Kansas City in 2021 and recording 76 tackles, one sack, a career-high three fumble recoveries, one sack and two interceptions to earn his second consecutive Pro Bowl selection. With a team-leading two picks and one fumble recovery, adding up to a team-best three takeaways to go with 83 tackles (club-best 60 solo) to rank third on the team and first in the secondary. In Sunday's season finale vs. Carolina, Mathieu needs six stops to tie his career-high of 89 from 2015 and 2018 and seven to set a new career-high and reach 90 for the first time in his career.

Mathieu's 28 picks since 2013 tie for fourth in the NFL.

### S MARCUS MAYE

•Originally a second round draft pick of the New York Jets in 2017 out of the University of Florida, Maye has is a six-year NFL veteran who has recorded career totals of 368 tackles (259 solo), 3.5 sacks, six interceptions, 26 passes defended, five forced fumbles and one fumble recovery in 70 career games, all starts. Despite missing five contests, Maye has recorded 60 tackles and one forced fumble to tie for fifth on the team in stops for the league's seventh ranked pass defense and 11th overall defense. Maye is coming off a pair of performances in back-to-back contests, where he has led the team with a total of 18 tackles, adding two passes defended in the December 18 win over Atlanta, looking to return to the lineup after missing the Christmas Eve contest at Cleveland with a shoulder injury.

### CB MARSHON LATTIMORE

•Selected by the Saints in the first round (11<sup>th</sup> overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft, Lattimore started all 13 games he appeared in. He totaled 53 tackles (44 solo), a forced fumble, one fumble recovery, five interceptions for 85 yards and 18 passes defended, as he became the youngest Saint (21 years old) ever selected to the Pro Bowl and was selected as the *Associated Press* NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year.

• In 2018, Lattimore opened all 16 contests and posted a career-high 59 tackles (49 solo), two interceptions, 12 passes defended, a club-best four forced fumbles, tied for fourth in the NFL and three fumble recoveries, returned for 91 yards, leading the team in takeaways and tied for the NFL lead in defensive fumble recoveries, the highest total among defensive backs.

• A standout 2019 campaign by Lattimore resulted in him being voted to the Pro Bowl, the only Saints cornerback to ever be selected multiple times. Lattimore started all 14 games he played in and posted 57 stops, one interception and ranked first on the team with 14 passes defended.

• In 2020, he posted a career-high 62 tackles (52 solo), two interceptions and 11 passes defended as he was voted to the Pro Bowl for the third time. High expectations follow in 2021 as he signed a long-term contract extension to lock up the lockdown corner in the New Orleans secondary.



• After signing a contract extension at the start of the season, Lattimore posted 68 stops, three picks, a career-high 19 passes defended, ranked third in the NFL and one fumble recovery, being selected to his fourth Pro Bowl.

## INSTANT IMPACT

After missing ten games with an abdomen injury, Lattimore returned to action on Sunday at Philadelphia and made an instant impact, tying for the team lead with six solo tackles, a team-high two passes defended and returning an interception 12 yards for a touchdown for New Orleans' first defensive score of the season.

## THE SAINTS AND THE NFL

Lattimore's 78 passes defended since entering the NFL in 2017 are the most by a Saint and ranked third in the league despite missing ten games in 2022.

### CB PAULSON ADEBO

• New Orleans' third round selection (76th overall) in the

2021 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Adebo overcame not playing college football in 2020 to make significant contributions to the Saints secondary in his first season with the club. The Texas native finished his college career playing in 22 games with 21 starts for Stanford and recording 97 tackles, 34 passes defended and eight interceptions, earning All-Pac 12 honors in both 2018 and 2019.

• Adebo showed his development by opening opposite Lattimore in the 2021 regular season opening win vs. Green Bay and returning a pick 33 yards in the third quarter to become the first Saints defender to have an interception in his NFL debut since LB James Allen vs. Tampa Bay on September 8, 2002. He then added a second pick in the Week Five win at Washington. With a pick in the regular season finale at Atlanta, Adebo finished his rookie campaign ranked fifth on the club with 63 tackles (54 solo), tied for first with three picks and added eight passes defended and two special teams stops.

• Adebo fought off injuries and has played in 13 games with 12 starts to lead the team's corners with 59 tackles and added seven passes defended for the NFL's third-ranked club in opponent passing yards per game.

### CB ALONTAE TAYLOR

• Selected by the Saints in the second round (49<sup>th</sup> overall) of the 2022 NFL Draft out of Tennessee, Taylor has shaken off early injuries to play in 12 games with eight starts and has posted 43 tackles (36 solo) and a club-best 11 passes defended. Taylor's pass defense total is fourth among NFL rookies.

### NEW ORLEANS SAINTS AT ATLANTA FALCONS SUNDAY, JANUARY 1, 2023 • LINCOLN FINANCIAL FIELD NEW ORLEANS SAINTS POSTGAME NOTES

- The New Orleans Saints beat the Philadelphia Eagles Sunday, improving to 7-9. Sunday's win marks a three-game winning streak for the Black and Gold. The Saints now have a three-game winning streak in six consecutive seasons for the first time in franchise history.
- The Saints snapped a two game losing streak against the Eagles, with Philadelphia now leading the regular season series 18-13 and the Saints leading the postseason series 3-1.
- With Philadelphia dropping to 13-3 in 2022, this is the second straight season New Orleans defeated a team that finished with 13 regular season wins away from the Caesars Superdome. On Sept. 12, 2021, New Orleans defeated Green Bay 38-3 (finished 13-4) in a contest played in Jacksonville, FL due to Hurricane Ida.
- New Orleans finished the regular season with a 3-5 record on the road, finishing the slate with two straight victories away from the Caesars Superdome.
- New Orleans improved their record on New Year's Day contests to 2-2 overall, 1-2 on the road.
- Surrendering only ten points, New Orleans has given up 20 or fewer points in seven consecutive games for the first time since an eight game span from 12/16/91-10/11/92.
- New Orleans' six sacks tied the season-high total of six at Pittsburgh on November 13.
- The total net yardage totals between the two teams were split at 313-313 apiece.
- The Saints managed 130 yards rushing while limiting the Eagles to just 67 on the ground. Running back **Alvin Kamara** led way with 16 carries for 74 yards. Tight end **Taysom Hill** added 14 carries for 46 yards and a touchdown.
- The advantage in the ground game helped the Saints win the time of possession battle. New Orleans had the ball for 37:04 compared to 22:56 for Philadelphia. The Saints had just three penalties for 20 yards while the eagles had eight for 49 yards.
- The first quarter 15-play, 75 yard touchdown drive of 8:58 was the longest scoring drive of the season for the Saints in both number of plays and time chewed off the clock.
- Defensive end **Cameron Jordan** played in his 191st career regular season game as a Saint, putting him in sole possession of fourth place in club record books ahead of Black and Gold punter Thomas Morstead. Jordan finished with five solo tackles, a season-high three sacks for a loss of 16 yards, one stop for loss, four quarterback hits and one forced fumble.
- Following the three takedowns, Jordan's 115.5 career sacks rank 23<sup>th</sup> all-time in NFL record books, as he passed Pro Football Hall of Fame linebacker Rickey Jackson's total of 115 as a Saint and now holds the franchise record for takedowns.
- Jordan's three sacks, bring his tally of multi-sack games to 27 for his career, tying him for first in the club history with Jackson. His six three-sack games also ties him for first in club record books with Jackson.

- The Saints tight end trio of **Taysom Hill**, **Juwan Johnson** and **Adam Trautman** have accounted for 17 touchdowns (rushing and receiving) this season, which is tied for the most in the NFL in 2022 with Kansas City as a group and the second highest total in franchise history from the tight end position. The tight end group is now in a tie with the 2014 Saints in tight end touchdown production.
- Quarterback **Andy Dalton** is now 4-0 against Philadelphia as a starter, including wins as a member of the Cincinnati Bengals (2012, 2016) and Dallas Cowboys (2020).
- With 204 passing yards, **Dalton** has 37,978 career passing yards. He surpassed Boomer Esiason and now sits at 25<sup>th</sup> all time in passing yards.
- Linebacker **Demario Davis**, who led the team with seven tackles (three solo) and one pass defense, now has 1,206 career total stops, ranked third among active players behind Bobby Wagner and Lavonte David. Davis has 101 tackles in 2022, notching his sixth consecutive 100-stop season overall and fifth straight as a Saint. With 101 stops in 2022, Davis became the first Saint to reach the century mark in stops in five consecutive seasons. In his 11-year NFL career, Davis has reached the century mark nine times. In the fourth quarter, Davis stopped Philadelphia quarterback Gardner Minshew for no gain on a fourth and one quarterback sneak attempt at midfield to give the Saints offense the ball back. Both Davis and Minshew prepped at Brandon (Miss.) High School.
- Defensive end **Carl Granderson** received the start and had 1.5 sacks against the Eagles, as part of two stops (one solo), one quarterback hit and two stops for loss. Granderson's 5.5 sacks on the season are a new career high, surpassing his 2020 season of five sacks.
- Linebacker **Kaden Elliss** had 1.5 sacks Sunday as well, as part of a five stop day, including two quarterback hits and three stops for a loss, bringing his takedown total to seven on the season to lead the linebackers.
- Punter **Blake Gillikin** had a career day in Philadelphia with a career-best five of his punts downed inside the 20-yard line. Overall, Gillikin punted six times for 256 yards with a 42.7 gross punting average and a 41.5 net. With 30 inside-the-20 for the season, Gillikin surpassed the franchise record of 29 that he shared with Thomas Morstead (2019) from his first season handling punting duties for the club in 2021.
- Kicker **Wil Lutz** had a perfect Sunday going two-of-two on PATs and two-of-two on field goals. His longest of the day was a 54-yarder. Lutz has made four-of-five field goal attempts of 50 yards or more.
- Cornerback **Marshon Lattimore** returned to action for the first time since October 9 vs. the Seattle Seahawks. Lattimore helped close out the win with a fourth quarter 12-yard interception return for a touchdown. It was New Orleans' first defensive touchdown of the season. It was the first time he returned an interception for a touchdown since his rookie year in 2017. This was Lattimore's second pick of Minshew, having served the signal-caller his first career interception in a Saints win at Jacksonville on Oct. 13, 2019.
- With his rushing touchdown Sunday, Hill has 23 career rushing touchdowns, bringing him into a tie for eighth place with Rueben Mayes and George Rogers.
- Hill has a club-best seven rushing touchdowns in 2022. He needs one more to match his career-high of eight back in 2020. His overall touchdown total of nine, ties the career-best from 2020.

- Rookie wide receiver/return specialist **Rashid Shaheed** led New Orleans in receiving with a career-high six receptions for a team-best 79 yards. Shaheed also returned three punts for 15 yards and one kickoff for 17 yards.
- Linebacker **Andrew Dowell** led New Orleans with two special teams tackles and downed a punt at the Philadelphia 14-yard line in the fourth quarter.

### **Eagles Head Coach Nick Sirianni**

**Q. As you went into the locker room what did say to the guys after the game? (*Sal Paolantonio*)**

NICK SIRIANNI: Our goal from the very beginning has just always been about taking it one day at a time, trying to go 1-0 each day, in attempts to go 1-0 this week. Obviously, it was disappointing what we did today. Coaching, playing, everything.

But next week we'll have a chance to win the division title at home.

**Q. Why did the offense perform so poorly? (*Jeff McLane*)**

NICK SIRIANNI: I think you have to give credit to that defense. That's a good, well-coached defense with good players. Obviously, we didn't put the players in good enough positions to succeed. We didn't execute well enough.

It's always going to be those two things. I'm going to have to watch the tape and see what's going on, but there was no -- we didn't really have a rhythm going in that first half. I think we had three, three-and-outs, however many three-and-outs there were.

In one of them we got way behind the sticks. When you're not converting on third down, it's hard to convert on the one that was third and forever, but when you're not converting on third down and not getting drives sustained, it's hard to get in a rhythm, and that's exactly what happened when we didn't get a first down.

Why did that happen? Again, it's always going to be coaching, always going to be execution; and then obviously give them credit as well.

**Q. What's the concern level that you guys aren't playing at your best right now? (*Tim McManus*)**

NICK SIRIANNI: We'll take it one day at a time. We're going to try to get better from this one right here. I don't get too high when we play a really good game; I don't get too low when we play a really bad game. We played a really bad game today offensively.

We'll just have to look and get better from it. Again, I'm not ever going to be somebody that is going to hit a panic button. We're going to double down on the things we think are true and that we know are true, and we're going to get better from this.

That's all we can do. I mean, we have to own what we just put out there and get better from it by owning it and correcting the mistakes with great detail.

**Q. How much do you think the bad holding call on G Landon Dickerson affected the Eagles? (*Howard Eskin*)**

NICK SIRIANNI: It's never going to be about one play. Ever. It's never going to be about one guy. It's never going to be about one coach. It's never going to be about one play. [There were] a lot of plays that went into us not winning that football game.

First of all, again, credit to New Orleans. We didn't play our best game. I think that's known. Also, they prevented us from playing our best game.

So, whether I thought that was a hold or wasn't a hold, that doesn't matter, and it's never just one play that defines a game.

### **Q. What did you see from QB Gardner Minshew today? (*John McMullen*)**

NICK SIRIANNI: Obviously, he's going to want plays back. We're all going to want plays back, right? I'll have to look at the tape right there. Obviously 23 made a good play on the interception in a critical time on that one.

I'll look at what that really looked like up close. I don't want to comment yet. Obviously, it wasn't Gardner's best game and it wasn't our best game as an offense. Not even close, right?

Gardner is capable of playing better. We're capable of coaching better and we are capable of playing better as an entire unit.

### **Q. Any word on DE Josh Sweat? (*Zach Berman*)**

NICK SIRIANNI: I haven't received any update there. Just haven't had a chance to talk about it yet. All I know is he's doing better. [Senior Vice President, Communications] Bob [Lange], do you want to add anything to that?

BOB LANGE: Positively, he's going to be released tonight. So that's a positive thing. If we get anything further than that, we'll let you know.

### **Q. Why accept a penalty instead of taking third and six on that first drive? (*Jeff McLane*)**

NICK SIRIANNI: The one that they ended up getting the third and short?

### **Q. Third and two. (*Jeff McLane*)**

NICK SIRIANNI: I wanted them to be in a little bit more of a down and distance second and long in attempts to go to third and long; didn't work. When it doesn't work, I have to own that. I understand that.

I'm not beating myself up about that call, but just trying to get them into third and long and see if we could get a stop on second and 12.

### **Q. Do you have any update on QB Jalen Hurts' health since we talked to you Friday and do you think he'll be able to play Sunday? (*Eliot Shorr-Parks*)**

NICK SIRIANNI: He was close this week. Obviously, we will take it one day at a time. I mean, for me to say right now and today that, yeah, Jalen is playing or, no, he is not playing I don't think is fair to anybody, because so many things can happen in a week.

We're going to have to evaluate and see where he is. Nothing changes in that aspect of it. His health is the No. 1 priority and not putting him in a position that is going to risk his health.

Again, we'll see what happens. Obviously, it would be good to have him back just because of the type of person and the type of leader he is.

**Q. If he is medically cleared to play, will Jalen Hurts play? (Sal Paolantonio)**

NICK SIRIANNI: Yeah, if Jalen is able to go, he'll go.

**Q. On the QB sneak, what went wrong there? (Zach Berman)**

NICK SIRIANNI: I am going to have to see that. There was a mess of bodies in there that is pretty typical on that play. We have been pretty darn successful on that play this year, and it didn't work out on that particular one.

I'm going to have to look at that, because there were just so many guys in the box. But give them credit. They stopped it and they made a play, and we didn't.

**Q. Things had been going great for you most of the season. With Gardner you've had some setbacks. How humbling can the NFL be? (Jeff McLane)**

NICK SIRIANNI: Yeah, sure, you always -- I mean, you always understand that -- that's why you never want to get too up, and you don't want to get too down.

We're here now. We're 13-3 right now with a chance to go 14-3 next week to win the division. All our goals are in front of us. Any time you lose a game, any time you don't perform the way you think you should perform you're going to be upset and humbled, but that's not a bad thing.

You go back to work, and you get better from it.

**Q. On not having T Lane Johnson, and I think there were six offensive line penalties, how much does what factor in? (John McMullen)**

NICK SIRIANNI: I'll have to look at what happened with some of the false starts. We'll have to look at what happened there, if it was a miscommunication or whatnot.

But any time you lose a guy like Lane, obviously same thing we talked about with Jalen, that's the way this game is. We feel like we have good depth, that guys are ready to play. We'll look at the tape and see how they played, but obviously you always are going to miss guys that are the best at their position in the NFL.

"We've been humble about it. I just feel like everyone wants to see the top [team]. I know that for me, when I see the top [team] I want to beat them, so we know that we have a target on our back and people can't wait for us to fail. There's no pressure. You just have to go out there and do your job within your box and make your plays when they come, and have fun doing it. I feel like we came out in the second half and did exactly what we're supposed to do, but we just ran out [of time] at the end. We made some mistakes and they made some plays. We're going to be alright. I'm not panicking at all. We're in the postseason, and let's just get this one win so that we can breathe a little bit and get some guys back [from injury]."

### **On the NFC East Division title coming down to the last week of the regular season:**

"There's no pressure. I think you all [media] are going to make the most pressure about it, because at the end of the day if we have to keep rolling, maybe that's okay too. Life has a way of showing you when you look back on it. Sometimes you say, 'I'm happy that didn't happen because if this didn't happen, this wouldn't have happened.' It's just how you look at it. I wanted to get the win today and that's what we were aiming for, but at the end of the day our goal is to get to the postseason, win the division, and go win the championship. I'm just staying in the moment. Let's just take care of this week and we'll talk about the rest [later]."

### **On reaching the 10-sack plateau for the first time in his career:**

"It's a great feeling, especially coming off of an achilles [injury]. People didn't think coming off the injury that I would be back doing what I'm doing. It's a credit to just having a one-day-at-a-time mentality and enjoying the whole process. Now that I'm feeling real good, it's just going out there and making plays when they come. I'm just thankful to make history with the team [team single-season sack record]. With the defensive line, we just want to keep pushing and doing what we can to help this team win. It's a great feeling, I'm not going to lie, to finally get over that hump. I thought I was going to be stuck there for a minute."

### **On teammate Eagles DT Fletcher Cox getting emotional when he recorded his 10<sup>th</sup> sack of the season:**

"Fletch knows. We talk, and me and Fletch are always in competition. There was one point where we were going back and forth [on the career sack list] with him leading and then me leading in terms of career Eagles sacks. I'm just happy that I finally got double digits and then on top of that, we actually care about each other as a team so it makes it that much more special because you're celebrating with your guys."

## **New Orleans Saints Head Coach Dennis Allen**

### **Opening statement:**

"Hell of a win for our team. To come up here against an outstanding football team that we played against today and be able to come out of here with a win. I've been saying that the last few weeks, we have a gritty, tough group and there's a lot of fight in those guys in the locker room and they continue to do that. So really proud of our team, players, coaches, everybody."

### **On the offense in the first quarter and what the key was to taking the early advantage:**

"Well, I think we executed. There's a lot of talk about [Saints QB] Taysom [Hill]. I think we got Taysom involved early. I think we got Taysom involved late. He was a big part of what we did in terms of helping us win this game. I thought we threw the ball pretty well early in the game. We were good on third down early in the game. It became more and more difficult as the game went on. You're down basically what amounts to three starting offensive linemen against that defensive front so tough deal to do. But I told the guys in there, man, just the way that they finished this thing out, pounding the football there at the end was really impressive to see especially being down three offensive linemen."

### **On Saints CB Marshon Lattimore being back, not showing any rust and how big the play was:**

"It was huge. Yeah, huge. Man, he did a great job. I think the defensive back coaches made a couple adjustments over there on the sideline, little play that we kind of anticipated we might get. [Saints CB Marshon Lattimore] did a great job of jumping the route and finishing it. That's the other part about it, we've had some opportunities throughout this season and we haven't quite finished like we need to. Yeah, he finished the play, it was huge."

### **On the first drive of the game and going for it on fourth down:**

"Look, we knew that this was going to be a game, it was going to be hard for us to win the game for us to kick field goals down there. We knew we were going to have to be aggressive in certain areas. And that was an opportunity that we felt like we could be aggressive. Look, the next time we were down there I thought about going for it again on fourth down but we took the points there to make it a two touchdown game and felt like at that time that was the right decision."

### **On Saints DE Cam Jordan setting the franchise sack record today and what it means to him having been in New Orleans for most of his career:**

"Does that mean I'm a big part of it? [Laughter]. [Saints DE Cam Jordan] won't let me take credit for it, but I'll take a little credit. [Laughter]. No, that's awesome. It's awesome. Cam has been a great ambassador for our organization, for the entire National Football League. He has been a great player and probably an even better person. I couldn't be happier for our guy and it's an awesome accomplishment."

### **On what he has learned the last five weeks of the season:**

"I don't know that there's something I found out about them. I think I already knew. I've been saying this. I think we've had a tough, gritty group of guys. I know we haven't won as many games as we would've liked, but when you look at all the things this team has been through this year and continue to fight and scratch and claw. We've been in every single game and we found a way to close them out in the last three weeks. So that's been good to see. That's the type of team I think we could be."

### **On what the determination to win does for the team's culture and identity:**

"I just think it shows we're all on the right track. We're not there yet but we're on the right track. We're moving in the right direction. To have success starts with people in your building and I think we've got a lot of the right people in our building."

### **On their decision not to play OT Trevor Penning after OT Ryan Ramczyk was injured:**

“We’ve been repping [OT] Trevor [Penning] at the jumbo tight end [spot] for the last three or four weeks. I don’t know if it’s fair to have him repping in one spot, repping in one spot, repping in one spot and all of a sudden we’re just going to throw him out [there]. There could’ve been a lot of shuffling of the deck that could have potentially been involved in a move like that. We felt like one-for-one plug and play, felt good about [OT] Landon Young.
