THE MATCHUP

The New Orleans Saints will open up their 60th campaign when they travel to the Detroit Lions for their season opener, kicking off from Ford Field at 12:00 p.m. CT on Sunday, September 13.

Kenny Albert, former Saints LB Jonathan Vilma and Megan Olivi will have the call on FOX, while Mike Hoss, Deuce McAllister and Jeff Nowak will broadcast on the Saints Radio Network airwaves for WWL Radio. Mario Jerez, Juan Carlos Ramos and Victor Quinonez will present the game in a Spanish language radio broadcast.

Sunday marks the third-ever Week One matchup between the teams, with the Lions winning the 2000 season opener over New Orleans, 14-10. In the 2009 season opener, New Orleans overpowered Detroit 45-27, setting a then-club record for points in a Week One contest.

The Saints-Lions all-time regular season series is tied 13-13-1, with the Black and Gold having captured the 2011 NFC Wild Card Playoff. In the last meeting between the Saints and the Lions, Detroit held onto a 33-28 victory on December 3, 2023. The Saints have a 4-7-1 mark in contests played in Detroit, 2-2 at Ford Field since its opening in 2002.

The Saints offense is led by quarterback **Tyler Shough** and wide receiver **Chris Olave**, who signed a contract extension after becoming the second Saint record 100 receptions in a season in 2025 on the way to Associated Press All-Pro honors. At tailback the unit features **Alvin Kamara**, paired with **Travis Etienne Jr.**, who was acquired in free agency. Tight end **Juwan Johnson** finished with a career-high 77 receptions and a career-best 889

Running the ball and protecting Shough are New Orleans' top two priorities up front, having the team's first round picks in 2024 (**Taliese Fuaga**) and 2025 (**Kelvin Banks Jr.**) anchor the tackle positions, buttressed by the acquisition of left guard **David Edwards**.

Defensively, **Justin Reid** leads the back end, along with pass rushers **Carl Granderson**, **Cameron Jordan** and **Chase Young**. The team also added linebacker **Kaden Elliss** in free agency.

The Lions offense features Jared Goff, who had 4,564 yards and 34 touchdowns last season, while his 105.5 passer rating ranked third in the NFL. Goff has potent weapons in running back Jahmyr Gibbs and wide receivers Amon-Ra St. Brown and Jameson Williams. Defensively, the Lions are led by Aidan Hutchinson, who made 14.5 sacks.

THE HEAD COACHES



Named the 19th head coach in New Orleans Saints history on February 11, 2025, Kellen Moore joined the Black and Gold after serving as the offensive coordinator for the

Philadelphia Eagles in 2024. In his first season at the helm in New Orleans, Moore rallied the team from a 2-10 start to win four of the final five games. The Saints went 4-0 in the month of December, going undefeated in the month for the first time since 2011 and only the third time in franchise history. Moore put his imprint on the team in year one on offense, mixing a combination of rookie QB Tyler Shough, protected by a pair of promising young tackles in Kelvin Banks Jr. and Taliese Fuaga, along with WR Chris Olave and TE Juwan Johnson. Including Shough and Banks, whose 1,066 snaps on offense was a club-high to earn PFWA All-Rookie honors. Moore and his staff successfully integrated a total of five rookies into the starting lineup and important rotational roles. Before joining the Eagles in 2024, where the Super Bowl LIX champions ranked eighth in net yards per game [367.2], seventh in points per game [27.2] and second in rushing yards per game [179.3], Moore served as offensive coordinator of the Los Angeles Chargers in 2023 and the Dallas Cowboys from 2019-22 after starting his coaching career as quarterbacks coach in Dallas in 2018. In four seasons as offensive coordinator of the Cowboys, Moore's unit ranked second in the NFL in total offense [391.0 net yards per game] and scoring [27.7 points per game]. The Dallas offense was also the league's fourth-best passing offense [264.4 net yards per game] and ranked seventh in rushing offense [126.6 yards per game] over that span.

Moore played quarterback at Boise State [2007-11] before playing six seasons in the National Football League with the Detroit Lions [2012-14] and Dallas Cowboys [2015-17].

Personal: Born July 5, 1988, in Prosser, Washington. He and his wife, Julie, have two daughters, Halle and Madelyn, and two sons, Kyler and Beckham. His younger brother, Kirby, is the head coach at Washington State.



Named the Lions' 28th head coach on January 21, 2021, Dan Campbell enters his sixth season in Detroit in 2026. Under Campbell's leadership, the Lions have secured two NFC North division titles, an NFC Championship appearance and a

15-win season for the first time in franchise history. In his first five seasons with the Lions, Campbell's team has ranked top 10 in almost every major offensive category while producing 13 Pro Bowlers and nine Associated Press All-Pros. Since 2021, the Lions rank first in total yards [31,962], second in total touchdowns [274] and third in points scored [2,284]. In 2025, Campbell guided Detroit to their third consecutive winning campaign. Campbell brings 25 years of NFL experience, including 14 years as a coach and 11 as a player. He previously served as the assistant head coach/tight ends for the New Orleans Saints from 2016-20.

Background: During the span of his five-year coaching tenure with New Orleans, the club captured four NFC South division titles, ranked first in the National Football League in points scored [2,361], touchdowns [277], net yardage [31,147] and posted the third-most wins [56] in the League. In 2015, Campbell became the Miami Dolphins' interim head coach, where he took over a 1-3 team and guided them to a 5-7 finish. Under Campbell, Miami improved eight spots in the NFL's rushing yards per game rankings and saw five Dolphins selected to the Pro Bowl in 2015. Campbell initially joined the Dolphins in 2010 as a coaching intern before overseeing the tight ends unit for five seasons [2011-15].

Personal: Born on April 13, 1976 in Clifton, Texas. He and his wife, Holly, have one son, Cody, and one daughter, Piper. Campbell earned a bachelor's degree in agricultural development from Texas A&M

COORDINATOR CORNER


**SPECIAL TEAMS COORD.
PHIL GALIANO**

Phil Galiano is in his second full season as the Saints' special teams coordinator. A coaching veteran with 26 years of experience, including

ten in the NFL, Galiano spent six seasons (2019-24) as New Orleans' assistant special teams coach before taking over coordinator duties full-time in 2025.

In 2026, Galiano will shepherd a special teams unit featuring a new kicker (Daniel Carlson), a new punter (Ryan Wright) and additions in the return game.

In Galiano's first full season leading the Saints special teams, defensive tackle Nathan Shepherd was named the Week Ten recipient of NFC Special Teams Player of the Week honors, after he blocked Carolina's 48-yard attempt. Defensive tackle Bryan Bresee had the team's first blocked field goal in Week One against Arizona. Galiano retooled a coverage unit that had their top six tacklers new to the Saints leaderboard from 2024 into 2025, led by linebacker Isaiah Stalbird, who led the club with six stops.

Galiano's work from 2019-24 with Darren Rizzi, who served as coordinator, helped make the kicking game an important key to victory for New Orleans. On coverage units, J.T. Gray's 93 tackles ranked first in the NFL during that span, with the special teams ace selected as an *Associated Press* All-Pro three times. The punting game also produced the top five seasons in club history for punts inside-the-20-yard line. Since 2019, the Saints have excelled in the return game. Over the seven-season period, the team has been ranked sixth in the National Football League in punt return average (10.3) and are tied for fourth in the league with three punts returned for touchdowns.

A three-year starter at safety for Shippensburg, Galiano served as a tri-captain during his senior campaign. He helped lead the Raiders to consecutive winning seasons (1997-99). The Norristown, Pa. native graduated with a degree in business administration.


**OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR
DOUG NUSSMEIER**

Doug Nussmeier enters his second season as New Orleans' offensive coordinator in 2026, marking his 11th campaign in the NFL coaching ranks and 12th overall as an offensive coordinator at the NFL and collegiate levels.

A 25-year coaching veteran, Nussmeier returned to New Orleans in 2025 after originally being a fourth round pick (116th overall) of the Saints in the 1994 NFL Draft out of Idaho, playing four seasons with the Black and Gold. He re-joined the Saints after spending the 2024 season as quarterbacks coach of the Philadelphia Eagles.

In his first season with the Saints coaching staff in 2025, Nussmeier helped the offensive improve steadily throughout the season. Nussmeier and Head Coach Kellen Moore devised a scheme behind rookie signal-caller Tyler Shough that accentuated his abilities and helped the Black and Gold finish the season 5-4. Despite having only nine starts, Shough completed 221-of-327 passes (67.6 pct.) for 2,384 yards with ten touchdowns and a 91.3 passer rating, while leading the team in rushing touchdowns to accentuate his athleticism and earn PFWA All-Rookie. By season's end, the Saints had a pair of players - WR Chris Olave and TE Juwan Johnson - for the first time since the 2016 season.

Nussmeier finished his college playing career at the University of Idaho as the program's all-time leading passer with 10,824 career passing yards over five years (1989-93). He won the Walter Payton Award in 1993, which was at the time given annually to the top player in NCAA Division 1-AA after throwing for a program-record 33 touchdown passes and leading the Vandals to a national semi-final berth. Nussmeier was named Big Sky Conference Offensive Player of the Year in 1992 and was inducted into the University of Idaho Athletic Hall of Fame in 2008.

A Portland, Ore. native, Nussmeier and his wife, Christi, have two sons, Garrett and Colton, and a daughter, Ashlynn. Garrett played quarterback at LSU from 2021-25 and was a seventh-round pick of the Kansas City Chiefs in the 2026 NFL Draft.

COORDINATOR CORNER

DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR
BRANDON STALEY

Brandon Staley is in his second season as defensive coordinator for the Saints in 2026. A 20-year coaching veteran, including the last

nine in the NFL and three seasons as head coach of the Los Angeles Chargers, Staley oversaw a Saints unit that made great strides in his first season with New Orleans.

In 2025, New Orleans finished the season ranked ninth in opponent yards per game [299.8], fourth in opponent net passing yards per game [179.2], fifth in forced fumbles [11], sixth in opponent rushing yards per play [3.97] and tenth in opponent red zone touchdown percentage [53.2]. The club did not allow a 300-yard passer. The unit was especially stout on third down, ranking third in the NFL in opponent third down conversion rate [34.3]. The 2025 Saints were one of eight teams that finished in the league's top-12 units in EPA [Expected Points Added] against both the run and the pass, including second against the rush.

With edge defenders Cameron Jordan [10.5] and Chase Young [career-high 10.0] each reaching double-digit sacks, the Saints were one of only three teams to have two defenders with at least ten take-downs. LB Demario Davis led the team with 143 tackles and two forced fumbles. CBs Alontae Taylor, whose seven stops for a loss were tied for third in the NFL at the position, and Kool-Aid McKinstry, who led the team with his first three career interceptions and was tied for sixth in the league with 17 pass breakups, enjoyed breakout campaigns. Staley and the defensive backfield coaching staff also successfully integrated a pair of promising rookies into the lineup. CB Quincy Riley was named to the CBS Sports and ESPN.com All-Rookie teams after playing in all 17 games [five starts] and totaling 34 tackles, ten passes defended [tied for fourth in the NFL among rookies], one interception and one forced fumble. S Jonas Sanker entered the starting lineup in Week Two and led the secondary with 78 stops and ranked second among rookie safeties with three takeaways, tied for first on the team, earning ESPN.com All-Rookie.

ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH

ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH/
RUNNING BACKS
JOEL THOMAS

Joel Thomas, a 26-year coaching veteran, has tutored the Saints running backs for ten seasons [2015-23 and 2025-].

After spending the 2024 season coaching the New York Giants running backs, the Port Angeles, Wash. native returned to New Orleans in 2025 with the additional title of associate head coach.

In Thomas' ten seasons presiding over the Saints running backs, New Orleans tailbacks have led a balanced attack on the ground and through the air. The Saints' 170 rushing touchdowns are tied for fifth in the NFL and their 18,649 rushing yards rank 13th. A Saints tailback has ranked in the top ten in the NFL in receiving at the position in eight of the ten campaigns of Thomas' Black and Gold tenure, with the 1,084 receptions by Saints running backs the most in the league at the position. Thomas has helped his running backs earn six Pro Bowl selections - Alvin Kamara [2017-21] and Mark Ingram [2017].

Under Thomas' tutelage, Kamara, the Saints' all-time rushing yardage leader, was the only NFL player with at least 1,160 total yards from scrimmage in each of the seven seasons he first coached him, three of them 1,500 or more. In 2023, under Thomas' tutelage, Kamara, the team's all-time rushing leader, became the franchise's all-time leader in yards from scrimmage, rushing touchdowns and total touchdowns. Thomas also coached Ingram, New Orleans' career rushing leader from 2021-24, for six years, including two 1,000-yard campaigns. During his first New Orleans tenure, the Saints ranked in the top six in the NFL in rushing three times [2017, 2018 and 2020].

Thomas lettered at running back at Idaho from 1993-98, where he was a two-time first-team All-Big West selection and conference Player of the Year as a senior and still holds Vandals career records with 3,929 rushing yards and 51 TDs on 765 attempts. He was inducted into the University of Idaho Athletic Hall of Fame in 2008. Thomas earned his degree in public communications in 1998. He served as the head coach for the victorious American team for the 2026 Panini Senior Bowl.

SEASON SERIES HISTORY

The New Orleans Saints and Detroit Lions series is split down the middle at 13-13-1. This will be their first matchup against the Lions since a 33-28 Loss to Detroit at the Caesars Superdome on December, 3 2023. New Orleans will be seeking to make Detroit the 11th team they have a winning record against. The first game ended in a 20-20 tie on Nov. 24, 1968 at Detroit's Tiger Stadium. The two clubs split all 10 meetings from 1970-89. 15 contests have been decided by a touchdown or less. New Orleans and Detroit have split the last five meetings, with five decided by eight points or loss. The Saints are 4-7-1 in contests in the series away from home:

LAST MEETING

Detroit Lions 33, Saints 28; December 3, 2023 @ Caesars Superdome - The New Orleans Saints staged a massive rally, but a turnover and injury derailed the efforts and allowed the Detroit Lions to leave with a 33-28 victory at the Superdome. The loss, the Saints' third consecutive, dropped them to 5-7. Detroit improved to 9-3.

The Lions raced to a 21-0 lead in the first quarter, scoring on a two-yard run by **David Montgomery**, a 13-yard pass from QB **Jared Goff** to **Sam LaPorta** and a 25-yard pass from Goff to **Amon-Ra St. Brown**. The LaPorta score was set up when a **Derek Carr** pass bounced off the hands of tight end **Juwan Johnson** and was intercepted by **Brian Branch**, giving the Lions excellent field position. The Lions added a 26-yard field goal at the end of the first half, their only points of the second quarter.

The Saints were outgained 146-33 in the first quarter but bounced back in the second quarter as Carr led an 84-yard scoring drive that was capped by a six-yard touchdown pass to tight end **Jimmy Graham**, with both of his receptions on the season to this point being touchdowns.

Down 24-7 at halftime, the Saints scored two third quarter touchdowns (short runs by **Alvin Kamara** and **Taysom Hill**) to make it 23-21. The Lions added a short field goal to make it 27-21 and then Carr fumbled the snap on the first play of the next drive, the ball getting knocked out by left guard **James Hurst**, who was pulling. The Lions took over at the 23-yard line and scored on a 19-yard end-round by receiver **Jameson Williams** to make it 33-21.

Carr, who was 17 of 22 for 226 yards with the interception and a fumble, was forced from the game on a late hit by Lions defensive end **Bruce Irvin**, who drove Carr into the ground with 10:18 to play. The team announced Carr was in the concussion protocol and also had shoulder and back injuries, the third time of the season he was knocked out with an injury. Hill and **Jameis Winston** alternated at quarterback and managed one scoring drive, capped by a one-yard touchdown run by Kamara, his franchise-best 53rd, to make it 33-28.

Hill had 13 carries for 59 yards and a one-yard touchdown run while Kamara added 14 carries for 51 yards. Kamara also moved past **Marques Colston** for career yards from scrimmage. Receiver **Chris Olave** had five catches for 119 yards.

OPENING DAY OUTLOOK

- The Saints are 23-36 on opening day and will look to get their eighth opening day win in nine tries, having had a seven-game winning streak snapped in 2025.
- The Saints are 7-13 on opening day on the road.
- The Saints have 23 players on the 53-man roster that were not on the 53-man roster on opening day of the 2025 season. Of that group, DL John Ridgeway III was with the team but on injured reserve and CB Jayden Price was on the practice squad.
- Since the franchise started play in 1967, the Saints had four punt or kick returns for touchdowns on opening day. The last came in 2011 when Darren Sproles returned a punt for 72 yards at Green Bay on Sept. 8, 2011

DEFENSE ON OPENING DAY

- Since 1967, the Saints have had eight defensive touchdowns on opening day. the last time they accomplished this feat came in 2020 when Janoris Jenkins intercepted Tom Brady and returned it 36 yards for a touchdown, which paved the way to a 36-23 Saints win vs. Tampa Bay on Sept. 13.
- The Saints have had two players with three interceptions on opening day with the last being S Sammy Knight with three picks on Sept. 9, 2001 at Buffalo. The other was Tommy Myers on Sept. 3, 1978 vs. Minnesota.
- The Saints have had a player register three sacks in an opening day game twice. CB Alontae Taylor recorded three sacks vs. Carolina on Sept. 8, 2024. DE Joe Johnson recorded three sacks on opening day in 2001 at Buffalo on Sept. 9.
- Since 1967, the Saints defense has collected four interceptions once on opening day, when Myers had three and Maurice Spencer had one on opening day in 1978 vs. Minnesota in a 31-24 win.

OFFENSE ON OPENING DAY

- The Saints, who have had a 300-yard passer on opening day 12 times, will be looking to have a 300-yard passer on opening day for the first time since Derek Carr threw for 305 yards in the 2023 16-15 season-opening win over Tennessee.
- The Saints have had a player reach 100-yard rushing on opening day six times. If they have a 100-yard rusher against the Lions, it will be the first on opening day since 2009, when RB Mike Bell finished with 143 yards on 28 carries vs. Detroit on Sept. 13, 2009.
- The Saints have had a 100-yard receiver on opening day 23 times. If the Saints have a 100-yard receiver against the Lions, it will be their first 100-yard receiving on opening day since WR Chris Olave, who caught eight passes for 112 yards vs. Tennessee on Sept. 10, 2023. The Saints have had two players reach 100-yard receiving in an opening day game two times - Sept. 11, 2016 vs. Oakland and Sept. 9, 2019 vs. Houston.

FAMILY TIES

Numerous Saints players, coaches and administrators are not the only members of their families to make a name for themselves in pro football. 24 Saints players, coaches and front office staff have relatives who have played, coached or served in the front office in the NFL.

Tight Ends Coach Chase Haslett - Father, Jim Haslett, played linebacker for the Buffalo Bills from 1979-85 and finished his playing career with the New York Jets in 1986. Haslett was an assistant for the Los Angeles Raiders, Saints, Pittsburgh Steelers, St. Louis Rams, Washington Redskins, Cincinnati Bengals and Tennessee Titans and was head coach of the Saints from 2000-05, where he guided the franchise to their first playoff victory in 2000 and was named NFL Coach of the Year.

Defensive Pass Game Coordinator Terry Joseph - Cousin Vance Joseph is currently defensive coordinator of the Denver Broncos, was their head coach from 2017-18. He has also served as an assistant coach with six other teams, after also playing for the New York Jets and Indianapolis Colts. Younger cousin, Sammy, played for the San Francisco 49ers in 2007.

Vice President/Asst. General Manager-College Personnel Jeff Ireland - Stepson of Chiefs Hall of Fame linebacker/center E.J. Holub. Grandson of Philadelphia Eagles running back and Chicago Bears personnel executive Jim Parmer.

National Scout Terry Wooden - Brother, JoJo, has been a longtime scout in the NFL Player Personnel ranks.

Offensive Coordinator Doug Nussmeier - Son, Garrett, plays for the Kansas City Chiefs.

Edges Coach Jay Rodgers - Brother, Jeff, is a longtime NFL assistant who is special teams coordinator for the Buffalo Bills.

ROSTER ROLL CALL

On the Saints 53-man roster as of September 7 34 were on the active roster, a reserve list or the practice squad at the end of the 2025 season. Among newcomers, the roster includes six unrestricted free agents, four veteran free agents, three waiver acquisitions, one trade acquisition and five draft picks.

Of the players, 23 have less than four years of previous NFL experience, including six rookies. The following is a breakdown of New Orleans' roster by years of experience [year entering]: 16 years - 1, 10 years - 3, 9 years - 3, 8 years - 4, 7 years - 5, 6 years - 4, 5 years - 4, 4 years - 5, 3 years - 7, 2 years - 8, 1 year - 2, rookies - 6.

FORMER STANDOUT DREW BREES INDUCTED AS PART OF PRO FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME'S CLASS OF 2026.

Former New Orleans Saints quarterback Drew Brees was the franchise's inaugural first-ballot selection to the Pro Football Hall of Fame, following the induction ceremony on August 8.

Brees was a two-time AP NFL Offensive Player of the Year, named to 13 Pro Bowls and five AP All-Pro teams and was the 2004 NFL Comeback Player of the Year. Overall, in his 20-year NFL career, he played in 287 regular season games (286 starts) and completed 7,142-of-10,551 passes (67.7 pct.) for 80,358 yards, 571 touchdown passes and a 98.7 passer rating. He set numerous NFL passing records and retired as the league's all-time leader in passing yardage (80,358), completions (7,142) passing attempts (10,551), ranked second in career completion percentage (67.7%) and touchdown passes (571) and fifth in passer rating (98.7). Brees set marks for touchdown passes in a game (seven, tied with seven other players), completion percentage in a season (74.4, 2018) and in a game (96.7, 12/16/19), completions in a season (471, 2016-broken), 300-yard passing games in a season (13, 2011), consecutive games with at least 300 yards passing (nine, twice), career passing yards (80,358-since broken), passing yards in a four-season span (20,767, 2011-14), in a five-season span (25,637, 2011-15) and in a six-season span (30,845, 2011-16), most seasons leading the league in passing yardage (seven), consecutive games with a touchdown pass (54, 2009-12), games with four-plus touchdown passes (37), four TD passes and zero interceptions (25), games with five-plus TD passes (11) consecutive games with at least three touchdown passes and zero interceptions (four, tied with three other players), overall (10) and consecutive (nine) seasons with at least 30 TD passes, career 300-yard passing games (123) and career 350-yard passing games (63).



The Austin, Texas native retired holding four of the top five most accurate seasons in league history and threw for 5,000 yards an NFL-record five times, a feat no other player has accomplished more than two times.

Brees' record as a starter for the Saints was 151-94 (.616) in the regular season and postseason combined, easily making him the winningest signal-caller in franchise history. Posting a 144-85 (.629) record in the regular season and postseason with Sean Payton as his head coach, the Payton-Brees head coach/starting quarterback combination is tied for second in total wins all-time. Brees retired as the holder of virtually every passing record in club record books with his 15 years of service and 228 regular season starts, both the highest totals in the team's history at the time. From 2006-20, Brees led the NFL with 68,010 passing yards, 491 touchdowns, 8,742 attempts, 6,017 completions, a 68.8 completion percentage, 116 games with at least 300 yards passing, 16 with at least 400 and 518 completions of 25 yards or more.

Brees was inducted in Canton on August 8 in front of an enthusiastic crowd of Saints supporters and will be inducted into the team's Ring of Honor on October 11 at halftime of the Saints-Vikings contest..



LATE SEASON SURGE

Following a 2-10 start to the 2025 season, the Saints got hotter as the weather got colder, winning all four contests in the month of December, to set up the team's first four-game winning streak in the same campaign since 2020. This is only the third time in the month of December that the team won all their games, joining the 1987 and 2011 squads.

For Head Coach Kellen Moore, he became the second first-year head coach in Saints history to have a winning streak of at least four games.

New Orleans' late season success can be attributed to improvements in several areas on both offense and defense. Several areas of success are highlighted below, which accounted for the four-game winning streak which the team hopes to use a springboard into the 2026 campaign:

BUCKING THE ODDS

The Saints have a long tradition of finding players as free agents signed after the draft who make an impact immediately or after developing their careers initially on the practice squad. Several undrafted Saints on the roster have played key roles on offense, defense and special teams.

Over the past 22 years, the Saints [2018-22: defensive back **J.T. Gray**, wide receiver/return specialist **Deonte Harty** and wide receiver/return specialist **Rashid Shaheed**] and San Diego/Los Angeles Chargers [2003: guard **Kris Dielman**, tight end **Antonio Gates** and wide receiver **Kasim Osgood**] are the only two teams to have three players signed as undrafted free agents be selected to a Pro Bowl for the team that originally signed them.

EDGE **Carl Granderson** joined the club in 2019 as an undrafted free agent out of the University of Wyoming and has appeared in 105 games with 47 starts, posting 297 tackles [174 solo], 34.5 sacks for a loss of 208 yards, ten pass breakups, one interception, four forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries, one blocked field goal and one blocked extra point.

In 2025, Granderson enjoyed a productive season, recording 57 total tackles [35 solo], six sacks, ranking third on the team, one pick, four pass breakups. In three games this season, he recorded more than one sack, playing an important role on a front line of a defense that finished ranked ninth in the NFL in opponent net yards per game and sixth in opponent net yards per play.

Granderson enjoyed a monster performance in the season finale at Atlanta, when he tied a career-high with ten tackles [five solo stops tied career-best], 1.5 sacks, his first career interception and three stops for loss.



Tight end **Juwan Johnson** first led Saints tight ends with four touchdown receptions in 2021, converting to the position that offseason after playing wideout in college and as a rookie in 2020, signing as an undrafted free agent from Oregon. Johnson led Saints tight ends with 50 receptions for a club-best 548 yards in 2024, adding three TD grabs. He ranks second on the Saints with 17 receiving touchdowns over the past four seasons, tied for seventh over that period among NFL tight ends. In his career, Johnson has played in 84 games [44 starts], making 223 receptions for 2,511 yards with 21 TDs.

In 2025, Johnson finished ranked fifth among tight ends in receiving and third in receiving yards with a career-high 77 grabs for a career-best 889 yards with three touchdowns. His 219 receptions as a tight end [four additional were as a WR in 2020] are ranked third among the position all-time for the club. His 223 career catches are second among Saints originally signed as an undrafted free agent.

Signing following the 2024 NFL Draft, linebacker **Isaiah Stalbird** played at Nebraska [2019] and South Dakota State [2020-23]. He appeared in 64 games in his college career and made 251 tackles, 18.5 for loss, three sacks, an interception, 19 pass breakups, five forced fumbles, two recoveries and three blocked punts for the 2022 and 2023 FCS National Champions. In 2025, Stalbird had a team-high 19 coverage stops and added 11 defensive tackles, two sacks, to lead the team’s linebacker corps and one pass breakup.

2025 DRAFT RECAP

The New Orleans Saints 2025 draft class, the first under Head Coach Kellen Moore in his first year featured eight players contributing to the team’s 53-man roster at the end of the season, three offensive players, as well as three defenders, with four (left tackle Kelvin Banks Jr., cornerback Quincy Riley, safety Jonas Sanker and quarterback Tyler Shough) starting in the regular season finale at the Atlanta Falcons and tight end Moliki Matavao and linebacker Danny Stutsman playing significant snaps. On offense, Executive Vice President/General Manager Mickey Loomis split the selections among four different positions.

Defensively, New Orleans added players at four different positions as the unit makes the switch to Defensive Coordinator Brandon Staley’s 3-4 scheme, a safety, a linebacker and a cornerback currently contributing. With Sanker posting his second interception of the season in the December 21 win against the Jets, for three total takeaways on the season, the most by a Saints rookie since 2021.

2025 saw significant contributions from most of the rookie class. Banks opened all 17 games at one of the NFL’s most challenging positions. Riley played in all 17 games with five starts and recorded 34 tackles, one interception, ten pass breakups and one forced fumble for the NFL’s fourth-ranked pass defense. Sanker played in all 17 games with 16 starts and finished second on the team with 78 stops to go with three takeaways and six pass breakups. Shough started the last eight games of the season and completed 221-of-327 passes (67.6 pct.) for 2,834 yards with ten touchdowns, a 91.3 passer rating and a club-best three rushing touchdowns.

Kelvin Banks Jr. was selected with the ninth overall pick out of Texas, the highest selection by the Black and Gold since 2005. A three-year starter who opened all 42 games he played in at left tackle for the Longhorns from 2022-24, Banks was the 2024 Outland Trophy winner and a unanimous All-American selection. In his first season, Banks lined up at the position that he manned flawlessly as a college standout, facing weekly challenges from some of the NFL’s elite pass rushers. He was a consensus All-Rookie selection and was the only Saints offensive lineman to open every contest. Surrendering only four sacks, when often left on an island, for rookie tackles who started at least 16 of their team’s contests, Banks gave up the fewest takedowns.

The Saints selected **Tyler Shough** out of Louisville with the team’s selection in the second round (40th overall) of the 2025 NFL Draft. In seven seasons at Oregon (2018-20), Texas Tech (2021-23) and Louisville (2024), Shough played in 42 games and completed 599-of-951 passes (63.0 pct.) for 7,820 yards with 59 touchdowns, also carrying 246 times for 733 yards with 11 scores.

In 11 games with nine starts, Shough completed 221-of-327 passes (67.6 pct.-third all-time among qualifying NFL rookies) for 2,384 yards with ten touchdowns, six interceptions and a 91.3 passer rating, while also carrying 47 times for 186 yards with a team-leading touchdowns and an additional two-point conversion rush. Among qualifying passers, he ranked first in the NFL in third down passer rating (103.3).

Setting every rookie passing record in team history, Shough snuck up on the competition as a consensus all-rookie selection and finalist for *Associated Press* NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year honors. Posting a 5-4 record as the team’s starter, the Chandler, Ariz. native led all rookie signal-callers in victories, as well as several other categories.

Over the last five games of the season, Shough earned NFL Offensive Rookie of the Month honors, when he led the Black and Gold to a 4-1 record, including a four-game winning streak with three fourth quarter game-winning drives. During the period he completed 114-of-163 passes (69.9 pct.) for 1,316 yards with five touchdowns, two interceptions and a 99.1 passer rating (111.6 on third down) over the final month of the regular season. Shough also rushed 24 times for 135 yards with three touchdowns during the stretch.

The Saints selected **Vernon Broughton** out of Texas with the team’s first selection in the third round (71st overall) of the 2025 NFL Draft. The Houston, Texas native spent five seasons with the Longhorns, seeing action in 56 career games with 18 starts and was credited with 70 tackles (39 solo), 10.5 stops for loss, 6.5 sacks for loss of 40 yards, 15 quarterback hits, four fumble recoveries, three pass breakups and two forced fumbles.

SAINTS 2025 DRAFT RECAP [CONT.]

After recording three tackles in the team’s Week Two contest vs. San Francisco, Broughton was sidelined for the remainder of the season with a hip injury, but is fully recovered and will be competing for snaps in the team’s defensive line rotation.

Twice named a first-team All-Atlantic Coast Conference selection at safety, **Jonas Sanker**, the team’s second third round pick was counted on to lead the Virginia secondary in his last three college seasons. Known as a rangy and versatile safety, he totaled 273 career tackles [176 solo], 13 stops for loss, two sacks for six-yard loss, four forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries with one returned 40 yards for a touchdown, two interceptions, 17 pass breakups, 19 passes defended, one special teams fumble recovery and one blocked field goal.



Taking over starting free safety duties in Week Two, Sanker ranked among rookie leaders in interceptions, takeaways and tackles with 78 stops [46 solo], two interceptions, one fumble recovery and six pass breakups.

The first of two fourth round draft picks by the Saints, LB **Danny Stutsman** played in 47 career contests, starting 37, with all coming over the last three seasons at Oklahoma. The Central Florida native accumulated 376 tackles over his four-year career with 183 solo stops, 36 stops for loss, eight sacks, three interception returns for 70 yards, eight pass breakups, 11 passes defended, four forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. Stutsman was a first-team All-American for the Sooners in 2024, when he started all 12 games he played in and made 109 stops, eight tackles for loss and one sack.

In 2025, Stutsman played an active role on the team’s special teams units, where he finished third on the club with 13 stops and the club also inserted him into defensive packages, where he made 40 tackles.



The second of two fourth round picks by the Black and Gold, CB **Quincy Riley** finished his college career playing in 55 games with 36 starts in six seasons with Louisville [2022-24] and Middle Tennessee [2019-21], posting 159 tackles, ten stops for loss, 2.5 sacks, 15 interceptions, including two returned for touchdowns, 59 passes defended and a forced fumble. In 2024 when he was a teammate of Shough, Riley appeared in ten games with eight starts for the Cardinals and finished with 33 tackles [21 solo], one forced fumble and three stops for loss. Tied for the team lead with two interceptions and tied for ninth in the nation with 15 pass breakups [17 passes defended], earning second-team All-Atlantic Coast Conference honors.

After competing in training camp for a role in the team’s defensive packages, Riley’s combination of competitiveness and speed propelled him as has he moved into the starting lineup in the team’s three-cornerback rotation in Week Three, and for the the season, when he played in all 17 games with five starts in the base defense and recorded 30 tackles, an interception, ten pass breakups, one forced fumble and one coverage stop, earning ESPN and CBS Sports All-Rookie honors.

Riley finished the season tied for fourth in the NFL among rookies with ten pass breakups.

The first of two seventh round draft picks by the Saints, TE **Moliki Matavao** played four seasons at Oregon [2021-22] and UCLA [2023-24], where he started 22-of-50 games and logged 74 receptions for 998 yards [13.5 avg.] and six TDs. In 11 games with eight starts in 2024, he caught 41 passes for 506 yards and two TDs for the Bruins. Matavao ended up on the active roster for six games with two starts and contributed on offense and special teams, recording two receptions for ten yards. Matavao had three receptions for 34 yards in the preseason before suffering a season-ending knee injury in the final contest against Dallas.

The team’s second seventh round pick, Edge **Fadil Diggs** finished his college career playing in 45 games with 32 starts in five seasons with Texas A&M [2020-23] and Syracuse [2024], posting 120 tackles [65 solo], 32.5 stops for loss, 15.5 sacks, three passes defended, four forced fumbles and a fumble recovery.



In 2024, Diggs was All-ACC honorable mention, when he started all 12 games and led the Orange in stops for loss [14] and sacks [7.5]. Diggs contributed in five games for the Saints as a rookie and starts the 2026 season on the practice squad.

Jordyn Tyson was the eighth overall pick. He spent three seasons at Arizona State [2023-25] after spending his freshman campaign at Colorado [2022]. He appeared in 33 career games [23 starts], finishing with 158 receptions for 2,282 yards [14.4 avg.] with 22 TDs. Tyson finished with 61 receptions for 711 yards with eight touchdowns in 2025, earning AP All-American the second straight season. Tyson starts 2026 on Injured Reserve.



Christen Miller was selected in the second round with the 42nd overall pick. Miller spent four seasons at Georgia and appeared in 43 games [24 starts], recording 64 tackles [31 solo], 11.5 tackles for loss, four sacks and one pass breakup. Miller was named first-team All-SEC by the Associated Press in 2025, when he plugged the middle with 23 tackles, four stops for loss, four sacks, a team-leading 23 quarterback pressures and one pass breakup.

TE **Oscar Delp** was selected by the Saints in the third round out of the University of Georgia, where he spent four seasons [2022-25]. He appeared in 55 games with 34 starts and recorded 70 receptions for 854 yards [12.2 avg.] with nine touchdowns. In 2025, Delp started all 14 games and had 20 receptions for 261 yards and one score, while being a force in the Bulldogs run game, helping Georgia rushers gain 2,250 yards on the ground on 212 carries. Expected to contribute both blocking and catching passes, Delp caught one touchdown in the preseason.



G **Jeremiah Wright** was selected in the fourth-round with the 132nd pick. A guard who converted from defensive tackle in 2022, opening 25-of-53 games at Auburn. The Selma, Ala. native started 24 consecutive games for the Tigers over his final two college seasons. The 6-5, 331-pounder has been learning how to use his large frame both run-blocking and pass-blocking, opening all three preseason contests at right guard.



WR **Bryce Lance** was the second of two fourth-round picks by New Orleans, with the 136th overall selection. Lance spent four seasons at North Dakota State [2022-25] and appeared in 57 games with 26 starts, catching 127 passes for 2,157 yards [17.0 avg.] with 25 touchdowns. In 2025, Lance was an Football College Subdivision first-team All-American, as well as a Missouri Valley Football Conference first-team selection for the second consecutive year in 2025, when he started all 13 games and caught 51 passes for 1,079 yards [21.2 avg.] with eight touchdowns. In the preseason, Lance competed for snaps and earned a roster spot in catching four passes for 44 yards.

S **Lorenzo Styles** was the Saints' first sixth round pick [172nd overall]. Styles spent three seasons at Ohio State [2023-25] after spending two seasons at Notre Dame [2021-22]. Moving to the secondary with the Buckeyes, he appeared in 35 games with 11 starts in Columbus and re-



corded 46 tackles and six pass breakups. In 2025, he played in 12 games with 11 starts and posted 30 tackles [18 solo], 1.5 stops for loss and two pass breakups. Styles, who has competed on the Saints special teams units, returned a kickoff for a 100-yard touchdown against UCLA. After competing on defense and special teams in training camp, Styles is currently on Injured Reserve.



WR/RS **Barion Brown** was a sixth round pick by the Saints with the 190th pick. Brown spent one season at LSU [2025], after spending his first three college campaigns at Kentucky. Brown finished his career second in NCAA history with six kickoffs returned for touchdowns [Southeastern Conference record], one shy of the NCAA record. In the return game throughout his college career at Kentucky [2022-24] and LSU [2025], he returned 65 kickoffs for 1,910 yards [29.4 avg.] with six touchdowns and 11 punt returns for 85 yards. On offense, the Nashville, Tenn. native played in 50 games with 37 starts and recorded 175 catches for 2,060 yards with 12 touchdowns and rushed 32 times for 228 yards with two TDs.



CB **TJ Hall** was selected with the 219th pick by New Orleans. Hall spent four seasons at Iowa [2022-25], where he played in 42 games with 18 starts and recorded 75 tackles [29 solo], two interceptions, 14 pass breakups and one fumble recovery. In his final season, he recorded 47 stops and a team-leading 11 passes defended for the Hawkeyes. Hall will start the season on the practice squad.

SAINTS ROOKIES

Of the 19 new players on the 53-man roster, six of those playsrs are rookies, including five of the 2026 draft picks and one rookie free agent that was claimed off waivers - T Mason Murphy [Chicago], who originally joined the Bears as a rookie free agent out of Auburn. This is the 20th consecutive season, the Saints have a rookie free agent on the initial 53-man roster.

ROOKIES IN THE STARTING LINEUP

First-round pick Kelvin Banks Jr. was in the starting lineup at left tackle in the 2025 season opener vs. Arizona. 20 rookies have now started on opening day since 2006. Banks [2025], Taliese Fuaga [2024], Erik McCoy [2019] and Cameron Jordan [2011] are the current Saints to start in their first game.

FROM THE FIELD TO THE SIDELINE

Kellen Moore was the seventh New Orleans Saints head coach to have played in the National Football League, joining Tom Fears, John North, Dick Nolan, Mike Ditka, Jim Haslett and Sean Payton. Moore, who finished his college playing career at Boise State with a record of 50-3, the most wins by a quarterback in NCAA history, played six seasons for the Detroit Lions [2012-14] and Dallas Cowboys [2015-17]. This Sunday, Moore returns to the sideline at Ford Field, where he started his NFL career as a backup signal-caller for the Lions, who signed as a free agent following the 2012 NFL Draft.



BARKING UP THE RIGHT TREE

With Moore as his offensive coordinator in 2024 with the Eagles, Philadelphia running back Saquon Barkley had one of the best seasons by a tailback in NFL history. The consensus National Football League Offensive Player of the Year, a first-team Associated Press All-Pro and Pro Bowl starter selection, Barkley led the league with a franchise-record 2,005 rushing yards in the regular season, making him just the ninth player in NFL history to post 2,000+ rushing yards in a season, eight-most in league records. Including 499 rushing yards in the playoffs which ranked third all-time, Barkley’s 2,504 rushing yards were the most in NFL single-season history [regular season and postseason combined]. **CONTINUED ON NEXT PAGE**

NOTHING HURTS

In 2024 in Philadelphia, under the tutelage of Moore who served as offensive coordinator and Saints Offensive Coordinator Doug Nussmeier, who was quarterbacks coach, Eagles signal-caller Jalen Hurts was able to put together one of the best seasons of his career. The Super Bowl Most Valuable Player ranked among the top eight in the league in yards per attempt (fourth, 8.0), passer rating (fifth, career-high 103.7), completion percentage (eighth, career-high 6.7 pct.) and total touchdowns (32, eighth). In Super Bowl LIX, Hurts completed 17-of-22 passes (77.3 pct.) for 221 yards, two touchdowns, a 119.7 passer rating and 72 rushing yards with one touchdown on the ground, the most rushing yards by a signal-caller ever in a Super Bowl.

FIVE STRAIGHT

In the Oct. 5, 2025 26-14 win over the New York Giants, the Saints recorded takeaways off five consecutive possessions. This was the first time this occurred in an NFL game since the Kansas City Chiefs intercepted QB Ryan Fitzpatrick on the last five Jets’ possessions of the contest in a 24-3 Chiefs win [Sept. 25, 2016]. It was the first time the Saints had defensive takeaways on five consecutive possessions, since they had five straight interceptions in a 27-3 win at the Phoenix Cardinals [Dec. 22, 1991]. GOAL LINE STANDS

In the Oct. 26, 2025 contest against Tampa Bay, the Saints succeeded in two short yardage situations against tall odds, putting the heart they have shown all season on full display in a valiant effort.

In the second quarter, with the Buccaneers having first and one at the Saints' one-yard line, the New Orleans front seven stopped Buccaneers RB Rachaad White from entering the end zone on three straight plays, with Chris Rumph II and Nathan Shepherd stuffing Tampa Bay RB Sean Tucker on fourth-and-one.



In Tampa Bay's first drive of the third quarter, the Buccaneers advanced to the New Orleans one-yard line following a 22-yard completion from QB Baker Mayfield to tight end Cade Otton. On a pair of goal line plays, CB Kool-Aid McKinstry successfully defended Mayfield pass attempts to wideouts Sterling Shepard and Emeka Egbuka. On second down, LB Demario Davis stuffed Tucker. Until Tucker reached the end zone on fourth and one, the Saints had successfully defended the one-yard line seven times in the contest, the first time a team had done so since the December 8, 2013 matchup where Tennessee Titans managed seven stops from the one-yard line by the Denver Broncos at Empower Field at Mile High [credit-ESPN].

SACK ATTACK

In the December 21, 2025 29-6 win over the New York Jets, the Saints’ eight sacks of Jets signal-caller Brady Cook is tied for the second-highest single-game sack total in franchise record books. New Orleans finished the season tied for tenth in the National Football League with 45 quarterback take-downs.

DOUBLE TROUBLE

With edge defenders Cameron Jordan [10.5] and Chase Young [10] each reaching double-digit sacks for the season, the Saints were only one of three NFL teams in 2025 to have two defenders with at least ten sacks each. Jordan and Young joined the Houston Texans’ Will Anderson Jr. and Danielle Hunter and the Detroit Lions’ Aidan Hutchinson and Al Quadin Muhammad as the league’s three double-digit sack duos from the same team. 2025 marks the ninth time and first since 2013 that two Saints have recorded double-digit quarterback sacks.



PICK ME UP

The 2025 Saints were tied for fourth in the NFL with ten fumble recoveries, one of nine teams in double-digit totals. Former Ohio State teammates EDGE Chase Young and LB Pete Werner tied two other players for the league lead with three recoveries apiece.

2024 DRAFT CONTRIBUTORS

The team’s top three selections in the 2024 NFL Draft started multiple games for the Saints in both 2024 and 2025. Below is a summary of the performance of five of the top six 2024 draft picks, as each of them made a jump in 2025 and will look to continue to rise in 2026:

Right Tackle Taliese Fuaga, Oregon State [first round] - Selected with the 14th overall pick out of Oregon State, the Saints were able to address an immediate need, while also acquiring a cornerstone for the future. Fuaga was an anchor on the Saints offensive line in his rookie campaign, seamlessly moving over to the left tackle position for his first NFL season, where he opened every game for an offense that improved in every rushing metric. Starting all 17 games, he was the first Saint to start every game in his rookie year at the offensive line’s most challenging position since J.T. Taylor in 1978. In 2025, Fuaga moved back to his natural right tackle position, starting 13 games as a bookend to left tackle Kelvin Banks Jr., as the duo serve as building blocks for the New Orleans front line moving forward.



Cornerback Kool-Aid McKinstry, Alabama [second round] - Selected in the second round of the 2024 NFL Draft with the 41st overall pick out of Alabama, McKinstry arrived in New Orleans having covered many of the nation’s top wideouts in the Southeastern Conference for three years. In 2023, the consensus first-team All-American was a semifinalist for the Jim Thorpe Award in his final college campaign, making 32 tackles and seven passes defended.

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[2024 DRAFT CONTRIBUTORS]

Opening every contest in his second season in 2025, he recorded 76 tackles (59 solo) with, three interceptions and a club-best 17 pass breakups, tied for sixth in the National Football League and third in the NFC. The Pinson, Ala. native recorded the first two picks of his career in the October 5, 2025 win over the New York Giants, capturing NFC Defensive Player of the Week honors for the first time in his career. In 32 career games with 26 starts, he has totals of 117 stops (90 solo), three picks, 24 pass breakups and one special teams tackle.

Quarterback Spencer Rattler, South Carolina [D5a]
- Selected with the team’s first selection in the fifth round (150th overall) out of South Carolina, Rattler completed 900-of-1,313 passes (68.5 pct.) for 10,807 yards with 77 touchdowns and only 32 interceptions for the Gamecocks (2022-23) and Oklahoma (2019-21).

As a rookie in 2024, Rattler appeared in seven games with six starts, he completed 130-of-228 passes for a Saints rookie-record 1,317 yards with four touchdowns, also carrying 18 times for 146 yards. In 2025 in nine games with eight starts, Rattler completed 173-of-257 passes (67.3 pct.) for 1,586 yards with eight touchdowns, five interceptions and an 86.8 passer rating. Rattler utilized his feet well, carrying 31 times for 167 yards (5.4 avg.).



LB Jaylan Ford, Texas [D5c] - The last of three fifth round draft picks by the club in 2024, Ford was selected out of Texas, where he posted 287 tackles, 27.5 stops for loss, three sacks, ten pass breakups, six interceptions, four forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries. As a rookie, Ford established a role on special teams, contributing five tackles before suffering a fibula injury in Week 17. In 2025, he had nine coverage tackles and two defensive stops.



In the 2026 preseason, Ford stepped up in starting and play-calling duty before being placed on Injured Reserve-designated to return prior to Week One.

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DT Khristian Boyd, Northern Iowa [D6] - A sixth round selection, Boyd appeared in 49 career games in college and collected 149 tackles [59 solo], 22.5 stops for loss, 10.5 sacks, five pass breakups and two forced fumbles.



In his final college season, Boyd started all 11 games along and had 43 stops, 6.5 tackles for loss, 3.5 sacks and a pass breakup, while earning All-MVFC first-team and consensus FCS third-team All-American. Following a full offseason, and utilizing his 6-2, 320-pound frame to fit into the Saints' 3-4 alignment, the Kansas City native led the Black and Gold with two sacks in the preseason, providing a push up the interior defensive line. Boyd had four stops in three games. He saw his most significant action in the season finale, when he saw action on first and second downs and short yardage as part of a standout run-stopping effort, where the Falcons were held to 49 yards on 25 carries.

SPECIAL TEAMS OVERVIEW

Saints special teams benefited from the elevation of Phil Galiano to coordinator, after serving as assistant special teams coach for five-and-a-half seasons before taking over coordination of the unit midway through the 2024 season. During Galiano's tenure, the special teams units have consistently ranked among the NFL's leaders in placekicking, coverage and return units, producing Pro Bowlers and Associated Press All-Pros, while also setting various club records in placekicking, punting, return game and coverage units. Under Galiano's direction, the club has committed to a transition of a mix of seasoned veterans and several promising youngsters, supplemented by some key additions in free agency and the draft in 2026.

BLOCK UNIT

New Orleans' field goal block unit came through big on two occasions in 2025, after doing so three times in 2024.

The field goal block unit's hard work carried over into the 2025 season opener, as third-year defensive tackle **Bryan Bresee** blocked a fourth quarter 46-yard field goal attempt to give the offense the ball back for a drive where they ended up scoring a field goal.



In the third quarter of New Orleans' November 9 win at Carolina, narrowly holding onto a 10-7 third quarter lead, DT **Nathan Shepherd** blocked a 48-yard field goal attempt. For his efforts, Shepherd was named the Week Ten NFC Special Teams Player of the Week.



COVERAGE UNITS

Galiano and Assistant Special Teams Coach Kyle Wilber were tasked with remaking the coverage aspect of the special teams units with the top six tacklers from the 2024 campaign not on the roster. Second-year LB Isaiah Stalbird led the team with 16 stops. Four of the unit's top five tacklers return to the team in 2026.

Signing following the 2024 NFL Draft, Stalbird played in five games and recorded three special teams tackles. In 2025, he played in all 17 contests and buoyed the coverage units with a club-best 16 stops, while also leading the linebackers with two sacks.

Signed by New Orleans following the 2025 NFL Draft, Rumph provided depth at the edge position and knowledge of Defensive Coordinator Brandon Staley’s system from their time together with the Los Angeles Chargers. He developed into a core speccial teams player for the Black and Gold and added 14 stops. In addition to his special teams acumen, Rumph has the intelligence and skillset to contribute at both the EDGE and inside linebacker positions.

The second of the team’s two fourth round picks in 2025, Stutsman immediately assumed a significant role on special teams, as well as seeing action on defensive packages, finishing third on the Saints with 13 coverage stops.

K DANIEL CARLSON

On August 24, the club signed veteran kicker Daniel Carlson to add competition at placekicker, with the team deciding to go with his extensive experience and success.

Carlson, 6-5, 222, was originally selected by the Minnesota Vikings in the fifth round [167th overall] of the 2018 NFL Draft out of Auburn. In eight seasons with the Vikings [2018] and Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders [2018-25], Carlson has made 225-of-259 field goals [86.9%] and 244-of-255 extra points [95.7%] for 919 total points. Since 2018, his 225 field goals rank third in the NFL, his 86.9 field goal percentage ranks seventh [min. 200 att.] and his 919 kicking points ranks fourth. Carlson’s 910 points as a Raider from 2018-25 rank second in franchise history. The two-time AP All-Pro made 22-of-27 field goals [82.5%] and 21-of-22 extra point attempts for 87 total points in 2025, including a game-winning career-long 60-yard field goal with eight seconds left in a season-closing 14-12 victory over Kansas City.

WRIGHT FLIPS FIELD

Ryan Wright was signed by New Orleans in the 2026 offseason as an unrestricted free agent after spending his first four seasons with the Minnesota Vikings, who signed him as an undrafted free agent out of Tulane in 2022. In four campaigns with the Vikings, Wright was among the most productive punters in the NFL, recording a career gross average of 47.9 on 253 with 42.4 net and 100 punts inside the 20-yard line across 68 contests. In 2025, the former Green Wave standout set career-highs in gross average [49.0] and net [44.5], good for third-best in the league in both categories.

QUARTERBACKS

TYLER SHOUGH

In 11 games with nine starts in 2025 after opening his first contest on November 2, Tyler Shough, the team’s second round draft pick out of Louisville, completed 221-of-327 passes [67.6 pct.] for 2,384 yards with ten touchdowns and only six interceptions, posting a 91.3 passer rating, also carrying 45 times for 186 yards with a club-best three touchdowns and an additional two-point conversion rush. A consensus All-Rookie selection and one of five finalists for the *Associated Press* NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year honors, Shough ended up leading rookie signal-callers in wins [five], third down passer rating [third-best 103.3], completion percentage, 300-yard passing games [two] and fourth quarter game-winning drives [three].

In 2026, Shough has assumed the leadership reigns of the Black and Gold throughout the offseason and in training camp, as he looks to continue his progression in his sophomore season, as well as helping the Saints take their next step forward in the team’s deveopment.

GAME-WINNERS



In the clutch, Shough became the first Saint since 2020 to lead the Black and Gold to two straight fourth quarter/overtime game-winning drives, when Drew Brees did so in 2020, including leading the team from a 17-10 fourth quarter deficit in the December 14, 2025, 20-17 victory over Carolina.

In New Orleans’ Dec. 28 win at Tennessee, Shough had his third of the season, with the Saints trailing 26-20 in the fourth quarter. Shough overcame a lost fumble by the Saints on their first drive of the final period. Following the fumble, Shough took advantage of the defense quickly getting the ball back and went to work with 8:45 left. Following a 12 yard carry by RB Audric Esteime, Shough completed a pass for a 60-yard gain to WR Chris Olave to the Titans eight-yard line. On second down, the rookie signal-caller and WR Kevin Austin Jr. connected in the end zone for a ten-yard TD to complete New Orleans’ comeback. Despite only playing in 11 games with nine starts, Shough’s three fourth quarter game-winning drives led all rookies and were the most by a Saint since Brees’ three in 2020.

HERE FOR SECONDS

In his second career start at Carolina on Nov. 9, 2025, Shough completed 19-of-27 passes for a then Saints rookie-record 282 yards with two touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 128.9 passer rating. His first TD pass was a 62-yard laser to WR Chris Olave, which was the second-longest touchdown thrown by a Saints rookie QB, with Archie Manning throwing a 63-yarder to WR Danny Abramowicz on Oct. 3, 1971 against the Houston Oilers. With the victory, Shough became the first Saints rookie signal-caller to win a start since Dave Wilson [at L.A. Rams, 11/8/81]. Overall he became the fourth Saints rookie to win a start, joining Wilson, Manning [1971] and Larry Cipa [1974].

RUN FOR IT

In the December 7, 2025 24-20 win at Tampa Bay, Shough achieved several firsts in using both his arm and legs to help power New Orleans’ 24-20 win over the Buccaneers. Shough completed 13-of-20 passes [65.0 pct.] for 144 yards, with a career day on the ground in driving rain, carrying seven times for 55 yards [7.9 avg.] with two touchdowns. Shough’s two scores marked the first time a Saints rookie had two rushing TDs since Archie Manning [vs. Dallas on 10/17/71] and his 55 yards rushing are the most in franchise history by a rookie signal-caller. Shough executed the first fourth quarter game winning drive of his career, when with the score tied 17-17, he drove New Orleans down the field 53-yards on nine plays, ending with a 13-yard rushing touchdown. In addition to the rushing touchdown, Shough completed three-of-four passes for 36 yards on the game-winning drive.

BACK TO BACK I

On Dec. 14, vs. Carolina Shough engineered an eight-play, 62-yard drive that took 55 seconds, ending with a 47-yard field goal by K Charlie Smyth. In it, he completed three-of-four passes for 43 yards and also gained four yards on a rush to help lead the Saints to the 20-17 win. In the fourth quarter alone, Shough completed 13-of-18 passes for 162 yards with the game-tying 12-yard touchdown pass to WR Chris Olave, as well as grinding out four yards rushing, for the second-highest fourth quarter passing yardage total in Week 15 in the NFL. With Shough’s fourth quarter game-winning drive at Tampa Bay the prior week, this marked the first time a Saints signal-caller has had fourth quarter/overtime game-winning drives in consecutive contests since Drew Brees in Weeks Five [team had bye in Week Six], Seven and Eight of the 2020 season. Shough and Jayden Daniels [2024] are the only rookie quarterbacks in the last ten seasons to lead a game-winning drive in back-to-back games against a team with a winning record.



BACK TO BACK II

In the Dec. 21, 29-6 win over the Jets, Shough went 32-49 for a career-high 308 yards with a touchdown, and zero interceptions. He also rushed for eight yards on two attempts. It marked the first time a Saints rookie signal-caller threw for 300 yards and only the second time an NFL rookie threw for 300 in 2025. Following the Jets contest, Shough No. 1 in completions [176], passing yards [1,792], passing touchdowns [7], passer rating [86.5] and completion percentage [66.4 pct.] among the 11 qualifying rookie quarterbacks in franchise history.



In the Dec. 28, 34-26 win over the Titans, Shough finished 22-of-27 [81.5 pct.] for 333 yards with a touchdown, zero interceptions and a 142.4 passer rating, setting career-highs in completion percentage, passing yardage, passer rating and yards per attempt [12.33], leading New Orleans to its third undefeated December in franchise history.



RUNNING BACKS

TRAVIS ETIENNE JR.

Travis Etienne Jr. is entering his first season with the Saints after agreeing to a multi-year contract during free agency. Etienne is entering his sixth NFL season after being selected by the Jacksonville Jaguars in the first round [25th overall] of the 2021 NFL Draft out of Clemson. In his first five NFL seasons [all with Jacksonville], Etienne has appeared in 66 games with 60 starts and rushed 897 times for 3,798 yards [4.2 avg.] with 25 touchdowns and had 168 receptions for 1,338 yards with seven receiving touchdowns. One of just three NFL players to have 500-plus rushing yards and 250-plus receiving yards each season from 2022-25, joining RBs Saquon Barkley and Josh Jacobs. The Jennings, La. native has also rushed 40 times for 238 yards [6.0 avg.] with one touchdown and has nine catches for 79 yards and one score in three postseason starts. In 2025, Etienne appeared in all 17 games with 16 starts and rushed for 1,107 yards on 260 carries with seven touchdowns, while adding 36 receptions for 292 yards with a career-high and team-leading six receiving touchdowns. His six touchdown receptions ranked second among NFL running backs in 2025 and his 1,107 rushing yards were fifth-most in the AFC.

ALVIN KAMARA

A talented runner and receiver who was selected by the Saints in the third round of the 2017 NFL Draft out of University of Tennessee, in 126 career games with 95 starts, Alvin Kamara has carried 1,675 times for 7,250 yards (4.3 avg.) with 61 touchdowns and has caught 606 passes (ranked sixth all-time among running backs) for 4,948 yards (8.2 avg.) with 25 touchdowns. Kamara is the franchise’s all-time leader in rushing yards, rushing touchdowns, total touchdowns (87), two-point conversions (7), total yards from scrimmage (12,198), all-purpose yardage (12,862) and first downs (601). In seven postseason games with four starts, he has rushed for 357 yards with three touchdowns, caught 33 receptions 274 yards and one TD and returned eight kickoffs for 214 yards for 845 all-purpose yards.



In 2025, in 11 games/starts, Kamara led the team in rushing for the eighth consecutive season and overall campaign, with 471 yards, despite missing the last six games of the season with a knee injury, with one touchdown and also caught 33 passes for 186 yards for 657 total yards from scrimmage.

AUDRIC ESTIME

A fifth round selection of the Denver Broncos in 2024 out of Notre Dame, where he has carried 210 times for 1,341 yards [6.4 avg.] with 18 touchdowns in 2023, the New Jersey native played in 13 games with one start as a rookie and carried 76 times for 310 yards [4.1 avg.] with two touchdowns. After spending the start of the 2025 season on the Eagles practice squad, Estime joined the Saints practice roster in late October and was signed to the active roster in Week 11. WIDE RECEIVERS

CHRIS OLAVE

This talented wideout made an immediate impact as a rookie in 2022 and has served as a primary target for the Saints offense. The former Ohio State standout has appeared in 55 contests in his first four campaigns with 44 starts, totaling 291 receptions for 3,728 yards and 19 touchdowns. After missing nine games in 2024 due to multiple concussions, Olave rebounded to appear in 16 contests, while leading the team in receiving in 2025 with a career-high 100 receptions for 1,163 yards with a career-high nine touchdowns to earn Associated Press second-team All-Pro honors. Olave finished the season ranked seventh in the NFL in receiving, eighth in receiving yards and third in third down receptions [30] after he reached the end zone for his career-high ninth scoring grab of the season on Dec. 28 in Tennessee.

100 CLUB



In the December 28, 2025 34-26 win over Tennessee, he enjoyed a career performance in powering the passing offense to victory. Olave finished with eight catches for 119 yards with one touchdown, as well as a grab for a 60-yard gain that was his 100th catch of the season. With the grab, he joined Michael Thomas as only the second Saint to reach the century mark. In reaching the 1,100-yard mark for the second time in his career, Olave joins Joe Horn and Michael Thomas [four], Marques Colston [three] and Jimmy Graham [two] to become only the fifth Saint to have multiple 1,100-yard receiving seasons.

A talented wide receiver who New Orleans selected with the eighth overall selection in the 2026 NFL Draft out of Arizona State, Tyson played in 33 career games with 23 starts for the Sun Devils (2023-25) and at Colorado (2022) and caught 158 passes for 2,282 yards (14.4 avg.) with 22 TDs. Tyson entered the starting lineup in 2024 with immediate results. He helped put the Sun Devils in position to qualify for the College Football Playoff in his first season as a starter and posted back-to-back All-American campaigns. Tyson will look to integrate into the Saints offense in training camp after a standout senior campaign, where he caught 61 passes for 711 yards and eight TDs, as he was selected as AP third-team All-American and first-team All-Big 12. He starts the season on Injured Reserve (hamstring).

DEVAUGHN VELE

This third-year wideout was acquired by the Saints from Denver near the conclusion of the 2025 pre-season. A seventh round pick of Denver out of Utah in 2024, Vele appeared in 13 games with seven starts, recording 41 receptions for 475 yards with three TDs, tallying the most receiving yards, receptions and receiving touchdowns by a Broncos' seventh-round draft choice as a rookie. The Saints have utilized the San Diego native's 6-5, 210 frame in key spots. In 2025, he made 25 catches for 293 yards with two TDs. He had 19 grabs in the last four contests before suffering a shoulder injury.

BRYCE LANCE

The Saints were pleased to find Lance available in the middle of the fourth round of the 2026 NFL Draft. The Minnesota native developed into one of the top offensive players in NCAA FCS football, where he played in 57 games with 26 starts, recording 127 receptions for 2,157 yards (17.0 avg.) with 28 touchdowns.

Lance started all 13 games, helping North Dakota State to a 12-1 record including an 8-0 mark in the Missouri Valley Football Conference and was named second-team All-MVFC first team for second straight year. The consensus FCS All-American first-team led the MVFC with 83.0 receiving yards per game and became the first receiver in Bison history with multiple 1,000-yard seasons, when he caught eight touchdowns and made 51 catches for 1,079 yards, the third-most in NDSU single-season history.

BARION BROWN

Saints' sixth-round pick out of LSU ranks statistically as one of the top special teams playmakers in college football history. Brown finished his career second in NCAA history with six kickoffs returned for touchdowns (SEC record), one shy of the NCAA record. In the return game throughout his college career at Kentucky (2022-24) and LSU (2025), he returned 65 kickoffs for 1,910 yards (29.4 avg.) with six touchdowns and 11 punt returns for 85 yards. On offense, the Nashville, Tenn. native played in 50 games with 37 starts and recorded 175 catches for 2,060 yards with 12 touchdowns and rushed 32 times for 228 yards with two TDs.

TIGHT ENDS

JUWAN JOHNSON

The former Penn State and Oregon wideout joined the New Orleans Saints in 2020 following the NFL Draft and transitioned to tight end his second season in 2021. Overall, Johnson's 18 touchdown grabs since 2021 lead the team. In 2024, Johnson stepped up after missing most of training camp with a foot injury to play in all 17 games with five starts and make a career-high 50 receptions for a team-best/career-best 548 yards. With a career-high 77 receptions for a career-best 889 yards (11.5 avg.) with three touchdowns in 2025, Johnson joined Jimmy Graham as only the second Saints tight end with 75 grabs in a season.



BIG TARGET

Johnson's 17 touchdown grabs since 2022 after converting to the tight end position from wide receiver are tied for eighth among tight ends.

DEFENSIVE LINE/EDGE

EDGE CAMERON JORDAN

New Orleans' first choice in the 2011 NFL Draft [24th overall] out of the University of California, Cameron Jordan has played in 243 career regular season games with 242 starts, recording 857 tackles [529 solo], a franchise record 132 sacks for a loss of 870 yards, three interceptions, 69 pass breakups, 17 forced fumbles and 12 fumble recoveries. He has been selected to eight Pro Bowls, the most by a defensive Saint and three Associated Press All-Pro teams.

SACK SURGE

Jordan's leadership and experience have served as a crucial component in a season that has faced adversity. Embracing a new structure on defense, he opened every game from the edge position and finished with 47 tackles [28 solo], a club-best 10.5 sacks for a loss of 64.5 yards, tied for 13th in the NFL, two pass breakups, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. In his last eight contests, Jordan recorded eight sacks, fourth in the NFL over the period.

MOST SACKED

Jordan is now one of only 15 NFL players to have at least 15 sacks against two opponents, 17 against the Tampa Bay Buccaneers and 26 against the Atlanta Falcons (in 30 games), both NFC South divisional rivals. Jordan’s 23 takedowns of former Atlanta quarterback Matt Ryan are the most sacks a player has had against an individual quarterback in NFL history.

Jordan has sacks against 29 different teams after dropping New York Jets signal-caller Brady Cook twice on Dec. 21. The Baltimore Ravens and Kansas City Chiefs are the only teams he doesn’t have a sack against.

Jordan has sacked 52 different players in the regular season after dropping Tennessee Titans signal-caller Cam Ward on December 28, 2025.



JORDAN VS. DETROIT

Against this week’s opponent, the Detroit Lions, in eight regular season games with seven starts, Jordan has made four sacks, one interception in the end zone for a touchdown and three pass breakups. In one of the most productive performances of his career on October 15, 2017, Jordan started his 100th career contest and made five tackles, dropped Lions QB Matthew Stafford twice for a 12-yard loss and picked him off in the end zone for a touchdown, deflecting two passes, earning him NFC Defensive Player of the Week honors for the first time in his career in a 52-38 win.



Jordan has four sacks against the Lions, tied with two other teams for the eighth-most to have a sack against. With a split sack against the Lions, the opponent would move into a tie for sixth-most with Chicago and with a full sack, sole possession of sixth.

JORDAN VS. GOFF

Jordan has four career regular season sacks against Detroit Lions QB Jared Goff, but all four took place when he was a member of the Los Angeles Rams. With one sack of Goff on Sunday, Goff would move into a tie with Gardner Minshew II as the fifth-most sacked signal-caller by Jordan.

CAM'S CORNER

One of the team's leading philanthropists, Cameron Jordan has been recognized as a three-time team nominee for the NFL's Walter Payton Man of the Year Award. Jordan is a weekly visitor to a local schools during the season to discuss topics such as literacy, academics and physical fitness.



CAM JORDAN FOUNDATION



Entering his 16th NFL season in 2026, Cameron Jordan, through his "Cam Jordan Foundation" is launching "Thank You NOLA," a season-long initiative dedicated to celebrating the city, people and communities that have been part of his journey since first arriving in New Orleans in 2011.

Throughout the 2026 season, Jordan will combine his final year on the field with an expanded commitment to community impact, creating opportunities to recognize local heroes, invest in young people and strengthen programs that will continue serving Louisiana Families for years to come.

The 'Thank You NOLA' campaign will feature 16 weeks of community engagement, surprise activations, service projects, fan experiences and charitable initiatives designed to celebrate the City while investing in his future.

AN EVENING WITH CAM



The Cam Jordan Foundation's signature fundraising event will celebrate Jordan's remarkable 16-year NFL career while raising critical support for scholarships, youth development and community initiatives on October 12 at Generations Hall (ticket and sponsorship information available at www.camjordanfoundation.org). The evening will bring together current and former teammates, business leaders, corporate partners, nonprofit leaders and community supporters to celebrate his legacy on and off the field.

A large portion of the proceeds helps support Jordan's "Cam Jordan Legacy Scholarship Program". The program invests in the next generation of Louisiana leaders by providing up to \$12,500 annually in tuition assistance for four years at an in-state college or university. Beyond financial support, the program provides mentorship, financial literacy, leadership development, career exposure, networking opportunities and internships to help scholars succeed in both in college and beyond. Currently eight legacy scholars are attending state colleges and universities through the program.



Proceeds from the dinner will also raise critical support for other important community initiatives that Jordan supports.

EDGE CHASE YOUNG

Originally selected by the Washington Commanders with the second overall pick in the 2020 NFL Draft out of Ohio State, this talented edge rusher finished his sixth season and second in New Orleans. In six campaigns for Washington (2020-23), San Francisco 49ers (2023) and New Orleans (2024-), Young has appeared in 72 regular season games with 44 starts and has recorded 169 tackles (110 solo), 32 sacks for loss of 202.5 yards, 39 stops for loss, 16 pass breakups, nine forced fumbles and six recoveries. The *Associated Press* NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year, Young recorded 7.5 sacks and made multiple splash plays with four forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries in his first season in 2020. In 2023, he played in seven games for Washington and nine for San Francisco following a midseason trade and tied his career-best with 7.5 takedowns in helping the 49ers advance to Super Bowl LVIII.

Young originally signed with New Orleans as an unrestricted free agent in 2024, when he played in all 17 games and posted 31 tackles (21 solo), 5.5 sacks, three pass breakups and one forced fumble and signed a three-year contract extension subsequently. In 2025 after missing the first five games with a calf injury, Young started the remaining 12 contests of the season, posting 38 tackles (22 solo), ten sacks to rank second on the team and tie for 15th in the National Football League, ten stops for loss, 15 quarterback hits four passes defended, two forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries, tied for first in the NFL with teammate Pete Werner and two other players.

**SPLASH PLAYER**

Young was the only player in the National Football League with double-digit sacks and three fumble recoveries, with only two players in the league had at least six takedowns and three fumble recoveries in 2025.

**YOUNG VS. DETROIT**

On Sunday, Chase Young will be making his Saints debut against the Detroit Lions. As a professional, Young has been a member of teams that played the Lions two other times. On November 15, 2020, Young recorded two solo tackles in a 30-27 loss as a member of the Washington Commanders at Ford Field. As a member of the San Francisco 49ers, Young started at defensive tackle in the 2023 NFC Championship, where he made three tackles and one stop for loss in the 49ers' 34-31 victory. On Sunday, Young will be looking to make the Lions the 22nd team for him to have a sack against in his seven-year NFL career.



DL DAVON GODCHAUX

Davon Godchaux (pronounced duh-VAHN GOD-chaw), a Plaquemine native, returned to his home state to play for New Orleans in his ninth NFL campaign after being acquired from New England. Originally a fifth round draft pick (178th overall) of the Miami Dolphins out of Louisiana State University in 2017, Godchaux has started 123-of-137 regular season games for the Dolphins (2017-20), Patriots (2021-24) and Saints (2025-), recording 474 tackles (221 solo), 5.5 sacks, 20 stops for loss, three pass breakups, three forced fumbles and one fumble recovery, as well as a solo stop in the 2021 Wild Card Playoff for New England.

In 2025, he played in all 17 contests with 16 starts and recorded 45 tackles (16 solo) and one forced fumble, plugging the middle for a run defense that improved from 30th in the NFL to sixth in opponent yards per rush.

DL NATHAN SHEPHERD

Originally selected by the New York Jets in the third round (72nd overall) of the 2018 NFL Draft out of Fort Hays State, this versatile defensive lineman is entering his ninth NFL season and fourth with the Saints. The Ajax, Ontario, Canada native has appeared in 122 career games with 50 starts, totaling 245 tackles (125 solo) and 13.5 sacks for a loss of 113.5 yards. In 2025, he appeared in 16 games with eight starts for New Orleans, posting 47 tackles (23 solo), 3.0 sacks, four stops for loss and his first career blocked field goal.

LINEBACKERS**PETE WERNER**

New Orleans selected this three-year starter from Ohio State in the second round of the 2021 NFL Draft. The Indianapolis native finished his college career playing in 47 career games with 35 starts, recording 185 tackles, 16 stops for loss, four sacks, 11 pass breakups, four forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Werner helped power the Buckeyes to the 2020 College Football Playoff championship game, when he was voted by the Big Ten coaches first-team All-Conference and a Butkus Award semifinalist. In five NFL seasons, Werner has played in 73 games with 63 starts and has recorded 402 tackles, 2.5 sacks, one interception, ten pass breakups, two forced fumbles and five recoveries.

In 17 games with 15 starts in 2025, he ranked third on the team with 81 stops (50 solo), two sacks, a career-high five pass breakups and three fumble recoveries to tie for the National Football League lead with college and Saints teammate Chase Young and two other players.

KADEN ELLISS

Elliss returned to New Orleans in the offseason after originally being a seventh round choice (244th overall) in the 2019 NFL Draft out of Idaho and spending his first four seasons with the club. Elliss is a strong, athletic player with coverage, pass rush and run-stopping abilities who by the end of his Saints tenure had developed into a three-down player. Returning to the Saints after spending the last three seasons with the Atlanta Falcons, in 2025, he started all 17 games and finished with 107 tackles (59 solo), 3.5 sacks, ten stops for a loss, ten quarterback hits, one interception, six pass breakups (career-best) and forced one fumble. In seven NFL seasons, Elliss has appeared in 99 games with 63 starts, recording 466 tackles (272 solo), 20.5 sacks, 37 stops for loss, 45 quarterback hits, two interceptions, 14 pass breakups, four forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries, and 15 coverage stops. The son of former NFL standout Luther Elliss with two younger brothers who currently play in the NFL, Elliss will look to bring a strong veteran presence and strength, speed and size to the linebacker room in his return to New Orleans in 2026.

FAMILY AFFAIR

Kaden Elliss has two brothers playing in the NFL with Jonah (Denver) and Christian (New England). The Elliss brothers are one of two families with three brothers currently playing in the NFL, joining the Sewell family - Penei (Detroit) and Nephi and Noah (Chicago).

To bring additional familiarity to Sunday's season opener against the Lions, Kaden Elliss' father, Luther, was selected in the first round (20th) overall by Detroit in the 1995 NFL Draft out of Utah. Luther Elliss was a two-time Pro Bowl selection for the Lions, recording 27 sacks, five forced fumbles and seven fumble recoveries. This will be Kaden Elliss' third trip to Ford Field as a player.

CHRIS RUMPH II

Signed as a free agent in the offseason, Rumph is well-versed in defensive coordinator Brandon Staley's system with the edge position. In his career, he's played in 54 games and made 66 tackles (36 solo), five sacks, two passes defended, one forced fumble, one fumble recovery and 22 special teams tackles, posting a career-best 14 coverage stops. Rumph finished ranked second on the team in 2025 in coverage stops to go with two takedowns and 35 tackles. In training camp, Rumph has converted to linebacker, where he can combine his hard-hitting nature, intelligence and ability to rush the passer.

SAFETIES**JUSTIN REID**

This versatile, hard-hitting, playmaking safety and Louisiana native returned to his home state after signing with the Black and Gold during the 2025 offseason. Reid was originally selected by the Houston Texans in the third round (68th overall) in the 2018 NFL Draft out of Stanford. In seven NFL seasons, the former Dutchtown High School standout has played in 121 career regular season games with 117 starts for the Texans (2018-21), Kansas City Chiefs (2022-24) and Saints (2025-), recording 637 tackles (449 solo), 2 stops for loss, 6.5 sacks, 11 interceptions, with two returned for touchdowns, 51 pass breakups, three forced fumbles, three fumble recoveries, 15 special teams stops and one blocked kick. Reid started all 14 games he played in, a stabilizing force in the back end and finished with 72 tackles (37 solo), a split sack, a 49-yard interception return for a touchdown and five pass breakups.

JULIAN BLACKMON

Blackmon is a six-year NFL veteran who was originally selected by Indianapolis in the third round (85th overall) in the 2020 NFL Draft out of Utah, joining the Saints at the start of 2025 training camp. He's appeared in 67 games with 63 starts, recording 300 tackles (224 solo), 1.5 sacks, 13 stops for loss, ten interceptions, including one returned for a touchdown, 22 pass breakups, two forced fumbles, four fumble recoveries, and seven coverage stops. Blackmon started the 2025 opener for the Saints before suffering a shoulder injury and will return to the team at full strength, bringing experience and playmaking ability to the defensive backs room.
