| 311 | Since 2014, the Steelers have recorded 311 sacks, which is the most sacks among all NFL teams. Pittsburgh has 34 more sacks than the next best team. |
| 250 | WR Juju Smith-Schuster is the third player in NFL history to register 250 career receptions before his 24th birthday. |
| 177 | Since 2014, the Steelers' offensive line unit has yielded 177 sacks, which is the second-fewest sacks allowed among all NFL teams. |
| 143 | Since entering the NFL in 2010, CB Joe Haden has recorded 143 passes defended, which is the most of any NFL player since 2010. He also ranks second overall among active NFL players. |
| 121 | Mike Tomlin and QB Ben Roethlisberger have teamed up for 121 regular-season wins, which are the third-most by a head coach-quarterback pairing in NFL history. |
| 96 | S Minkah Fitzpatrick registered a 96-yard interception return for TD in the 26-24 victory over the Indianapolis Colts on Nov. 3, 2019. The 96-yard interception return for TD was the second-longest in regular-season franchise history. The longest interception return for TD in regular-season franchise history is a 99-yard interception return for TD by Martin Kottler on Sept. 27, 1933 (the first year of the Steelers existence). |
| 87 | OL Alejandro Villanueva extended his regular-season games played streak to 87, which is the third-longest active streak among active NFL offensive tackles. |
| 85 | WR Diontae Johnson returned a punt 85 yards for a TD at Arizona on Dec. 8, 2019. The punt return for a TD was Pittsburgh's first since Antonio Brown raced 71 yards for a TD vs. Indianapolis on Dec. 6, 2015. The 85-yard punt return for TD is the longest punt return for a TD in franchise history and second-longest punt return in franchise history. |
| 84 | WR Chase Claypool hauled in an 84-yard TD from QB Ben Roethlisberger that gave the Steelers a 14-3 lead with 6:34 left in the second quarter. The 84-yard TD reception was tied for the fourth-longest by a rookie in franchise history. The 84-yard TD reception marked the longest scrimmage TD by a Canadian-born player in NFL history. |
| 66 | With the victory in Week 7, Mike Tomlin remained 12th in League history with a career record of 66 games over .500. |
| 64 | Pittsburgh has registered at least 1 sack in 64 consecutive games, which is the longest active streak in the NFL. The 64-game streak is also the longest in regular-season franchise history and second longest in NFL history. The NFL record for consecutive games with at least 1 sack is 69 games by Tampa Bay (1999-2003). Head coach Mike Tomlin was on the Buccaneers staff during the final three seasons of the streak. |
| 55.5 | DT Cameron Heyward's 55.5 career sacks are the second-most by a Steelers' defensive lineman, fifth-most among active NFL DT and eighth-most by any Steelers (since 1982). |
| 52 | Pittsburgh has registered at least 6 tackles for loss in six games this season. The 52 TFLs are tied for the most by an NFL team over its first seven games of a season since at least 2008. |
| 51 | Pittsburgh leads the NFL with 51 takeaways since the start of the 2019 season. The Steelers have forced at least 1 turnover in 20 of their last 23 games, including six games in 2020. |
| 41.0 | Since entering the NFL in 2017, LB T.J. Watt has recorded 41.0 sacks, which ranks fourth overall and tops among all NFL linebackers over that span. |
| 28 | CB Joe Haden picked off his first pass of the season vs. Denver on September 20, 2020. His 28 career interceptions are tied for the third most of any NFL player since he entered the NFL in 2010. |
| 27.0 | LB T.J. Watt has now recorded 27.0 sacks in 28 career games at Heinz Field. |
| 26 | Pittsburgh has scored 26 or more points in each of its seven games in 2020 (first in franchise history). The seven-game streak of 26 or more points is the longest such streak in franchise history. The Steelers registered a six-game streak of 26 or more points in 2015. |
| 26 | Prior to the Steelers in 2020, Kansas City was the last NFL team to score 26 or more points in each of its first seven games of a season (2018). New England (2007, 2015), Denver (2013) and St. Louis Rams (2000) are the only other teams this century to accomplish the feat. |
| 23-310 | WR Juju Smith-Schuster became the fourth-youngest player in NFL history to reach 3,000 career receiving yards and 20 career receiving TDs. At 23 years, 310 days, Smith-Schuster passed Odell Beckham Jr. (23 years, 325 days). |
| 22-297 | At 22 years and 297 days old, WR Juju Smith-Schuster , who now has 3,055 career receiving yards, surpassed Randy Moss (22 years, 310 days) as the youngest player to reach 2,500 career receiving yards in NFL history. |
| 21 | With their victory over Cleveland in Week 6, the Steelers have won at least 4 home games in 21 straight seasons, which is the longest active streak in the NFL. |
| 15 | LB T.J. Watt has recorded 15 forced fumbles in his career. The 15 forced fumbles are the most in the League since the start of the 2017 season. |
| 15 | LB T.J. Watt's 15 combined interceptions (3), forced fumbles (8) and fumble recoveries (4) lead the NFL since 2019. |

The last NFL team to play three consecutive games against teams with 1 or fewer losses starting in Week 6 or later was the 2004 New England Patriots. The Patriots only won two of those three games but would ultimately win Super Bowl XXXIX. |

- QB **Ben Roethlisberger** and C **Maurkice Pouncey** were selected to serve as offensive captains, DT **Cameron Heyward** and LB **T.J. Watt** were picked to serve as defensive captains and S **Jordan Dangerfield** was chosen to serve as the special teams captain.
- Roethlisberger was selected as an offensive captain for the 12th time in his career (2008-09, 2011-20). This marks Heyward's sixth consecutive year as a captain (2015-20), and the fourth time Pouncey has been named a captain (2013, 2018-20).
- Watt and Dangerfield were named captains for the first time in their respective careers.

- The Steelers are slated to appear in four nationally televised primetime regular-season games in 2020, highlighted by the franchise's first-ever Thanksgiving home game.

- The Steelers will play host to the Baltimore Ravens at 8:20 p.m. ET on Thanksgiving, Thursday, Nov. 26, on NBC. Pittsburgh has played eight times on Thanksgiving, but each previous contest occurred outside of Pittsburgh. The Steelers defeated the Indianapolis Colts, 28-7, on November 24, 2016, in their last appearance on the holiday.
- Pittsburgh will also make two appearances on Monday Night Football, which extends the Steelers streak to 16 consecutive years with at least one MNF game. Pittsburgh opened its regular season on Monday Night Football at the New York Giants in Week 1 on Sept. 14 (W, 26-16). The Steelers will also travel to the Cincinnati Bengals for an MNF contest in Week 15 on Dec. 21 (ESPN 8:15 p.m.).
- Pittsburgh's other nationally televised primetime game is scheduled for Sunday Night Football at the Buffalo Bills in Week 14 on Dec. 13 (NBC, 8:20 p.m.).
- "Flexible scheduling" will be used in Weeks 11-17. Additionally, in Weeks 5-10, flexible scheduling may be used in no more than two weeks. In Weeks 5-16, the schedule lists the games tentatively set for Sunday Night Football on NBC. Only Sunday afternoon games are eligible to be moved to Sunday night, in which case the tentatively scheduled Sunday night game would be moved to an afternoon start time. A flexible scheduling move would be announced at least 12 days before the game in Weeks 11-16 and at least six days prior to Week 17. Flexible scheduling will not be applied to games airing on Thursday or Monday nights.

DIFFICULT STRETCH

- Pittsburgh was the first opponent to overcome a halftime deficit of 10 or more points at Baltimore since Oct. 5, 1997.
- The comeback was tied for sixth best in road franchise history. The franchise record occurred in Week 6 of 1997 when the Steelers overcame a 17-point halftime deficit (24-7) en route to a 42-34 victory over Baltimore.

TOMLIN'S 100 WINS IN 10 SEASONS

- **Mike Tomlin** became the third head coach in Steelers history to record 100 regular-season wins in Week 14 of 2016, with the team's 27-20 victory at Buffalo.
- Tomlin joined **Chuck Noll** (1969-91, 193) and **Bill Cowher** (1992-2006, 149) in the team's 100-win club. The Steelers became the first NFL franchise with three 100-win head coaches.
- Tomlin earned his 100th regular-season victory in his 157th career regular-season game, which marked the fewest games by a Steelers head coach to reach the century mark (**Chuck Noll**, 158; **Bill Cowher**, 163).

**LET THE HORSES RUN**

- Pittsburgh has registered a 100-yard rusher in four of the season's first five games. RB **James Conner** ran for 101 yards on 20 carries (5.0 yards/rush) in Week 6 against the Browns. RB **Benny Snell Jr.** ran for 113 yards on 19 carries (5.9 yards/rush) in Week 1 at New York Giants. RB **James Conner** followed with 106 yards on 16 carries (6.6 yards/rush) and 109 yards on 18 carries (6.1 yards/rush) against Denver and Houston, respectively, in Weeks 2 and 3.
- The Steelers had not registered 100-yard rushers in the season's first three games since 2007.

- RB **James Conner** has rushed for 498 yards on 110 carries and 5 TDs over the first seven games of the season. He ranks 19th in franchise history with 2,079 rush yards.
- Conner ran for 101 yards on 20 carries and one TD in the Week 6 victory over Cleveland. He scored on a three-yard run in the second quarter to extend Pittsburgh's lead to 17-0.
- Conner scored on a one-yard run in the third quarter to give Pittsburgh a 21-17 lead over Baltimore in Week 8. The TD run was his fifth of the season and 21st of his career.

STEELERS RUSH DEFENSE TURNS EAGLES TO THE AIR

- Pittsburgh allowed just 162 yards rushing on the year entering its game with Philadelphia in Week 5. The Steelers then yielded a first-quarter 74-yard TD run to Eagles' running back Miles Sanders.
- Pittsburgh limited Philadelphia to only 20 rushing yards over its other 15 carries (1.3 yards per rush).
- Sanders rushed for just 8 yards over his final 7 carries of the game.

STEELERS HANDLE HOUSTON IN THE SECOND HALF

- Pittsburgh bottled up Giants' RB Saquon Barkley in Week 1. The Steelers limited the dynamic back to just 6 yards on 15 carries, tied for the second-fewest yards by any player with 15 or more rushes in a game since the 1970 NFL-AFL merger.
- Barkley's 6 yards rushing were the second-fewest of his career. He had 1 yard rushing in Week 10 of 2019 at the New York Jets.
- The Steelers were just the sixth defense since 1970 NFL-AFL merger to limit an opposing running back to fewer than 10 yards on 15 or more carries.

BALTIMORE -The Steelers started slowly but finished strong in Baltimore and improved to 7-0 with a 28-24 victory over the Ravens.

Baltimore fell to 5-2.

The game featured five lead changes, including three in the second half.

"This rivalry is what it is, man," Steelers head coach Mike Tomlin observed.

Nose tackle **Isaiah Buggs**, who was playing due to a knee injury sustained by **Tyson Alualu** early in the game, came off a block and started to take Ravens quarterback Lamar Jackson to the ground short of the line to gain on fourth-and-3 from the Steelers' 8-yard line just inside the two-minute warning. Free safety **Minkah Fitzpatrick** helped finish Jackson off on the play, which resulted in a fumble and a recovery by inside linebacker **Robert Spillane**.

The Steelers were unable to generate a first down and punted the ball back to the Ravens with 52 seconds left in regulation.

The Ravens took over at their 37-yard line and drove to the Steelers' 23 with eight seconds left in the fourth quarter but Fitzpatrick successfully defended Jackson's last-gasp pass into the end zone for wide receiver Willie Snead IV, with help from cornerback Justin Layne.

"This wasn't our best defensive performance," defensive end Stephon Tuitt acknowledged. "But those two drives we had to stop them on was what's most important."

Added Spillane: "We knew what it was going to take to win the game."

The Steelers rallied from a 24-21, fourth-quarter deficit with an eight-play, 80-yard drive in 4:27 that ended on an 8-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Ben Roethlisberger to wide receiver **Chase Claypool**. Kicker **Chris Boswell's** extra point gave the Steelers a 28-24 lead with 7:29 left in regulation.

The Ravens had re-taken the lead on their previous possession, an eight-play, 53-yard drive in 3:58 for a touchdown and a 24-21 advantage. Jackson finished the march with a 3-yard touchdown pass to wide receiver Marquise Brown. Kicker Justin Tucker converted with 11:56 left in the fourth.

The Steelers struck for two touchdowns on consecutive possessions in the third quarter that turned a 17-7 deficit into a 21-17 lead.

The first took advantage of a short field thanks to an interception by outside linebacker **Alex Highsmith** that set the Steelers up at the Ravens' 21 with 14:04 left in the third. Roethlisberger found tight end **Eric**

Ebron wide open on a shallow cross on second-and-7 from the Ravens' 18 and Ebron cruised untouched into the end zone. Boswell's extra point trimmed the Baltimore lead to 17-14 with 13:21 left in the third.

After the defense produced a three-and-out, the Steelers drove 77 yards in 10 plays for a touchdown and their second lead of the game.

Running back **James Conner** finished the possession with a 1-yard touchdown run. Roethlisberger had found wide receiver **JuJu Smith-Schuster** for 14 yards on second-and-13 from the Ravens' 15 just prior to the TD. Boswell's extra point put the Steelers ahead, 21-17, with 5:38 left in the third.

The Steelers gained 157 of their 221 total net yards in the second half.

Baltimore rushed for 265 yards and had 457 total net yards but came up 23 short.

"They punched us in the mouth," Ebron said. "We had to make adjustments."

"We fought our (backside) off."

The Steelers didn't produce any points on offense and only held the ball for 9:51 in a first half that ended with a 51-yard field goal by Tucker that increased Baltimore's lead to 17-7. Baltimore took over at its 8 with 3:44 left in the second quarter and was able to convert three third downs on a 15-play, 59-yard drive that exhausted the remainder of the first half.

The Ravens had taken a 14-7 lead on a 1-yard touchdown run by running back Gus Edwards and Tucker's extra point with 7:24 left in the second quarter. Edwards' rumble into the end zone capped a nine-play, 80-yard drive in 5:18.

Baltimore tied the game at 7-7 on 6-yard touchdown pass from Jackson to wide receiver Miles Boykin and a Tucker extra point with 8:48 left in the first quarter. The Ravens moved 75 yards in nine plays and ate up 5:22 on their second possession of the game.

Baltimore's first possession on the afternoon ended on an interception and 33-yard return for a touchdown by Spillane. Boswell's extra point gave the Steelers a 7-0 lead just 54 seconds into the game.

The Ravens went 5-for-8 on third downs and gained 254 total net yards, including 179 on the ground, while possessing the ball for 20:09 in the first two quarters.

The Steelers allowed an average of 68.8 yards against on the ground over their first six games.

The Steelers went 0-for-3 on third downs and had 64 total net yards in the first 30 minutes.

PITTSBURGH -- RB Ezekiel Elliott scored on a game-winning 32-yard touchdown run with less than 10 seconds remaining in the game to lift the Cowboys to a 35-30 victory over the Steelers at Heinz Field. The attendance of 67,737 was a Steelers' all-time record for a home game.

RB **Le'Veon Bell** caught a two-yard pass from QB **Ben Roethlisberger** to give Pittsburgh an early 6-0 advantage. K Dan Bailey connected on a 37-yard field goal to cut the lead to 6-3. Roethlisberger threw a three-yard touchdown to WR **Eli Rogers** to increase Pittsburgh's lead to 12-3. QB Dak Prescott connected with Elliott on an 83-yard touchdown pass late in the first quarter.

Teams exchanged field goals in the second quarter. Bailey made a 53-yarder, an NFL record at Heinz Field. And K **Chris Boswell** connected from 39 yards out. Pittsburgh led 15-13 at the break.

Boswell made a 25-yard field goal early in the third quarter. Bailey connected from 46 yards out on Dallas' next drive. On the Cowboys' ensuing possession Prescott threw a 50-yard touchdown pass to WR Dez Bryant to give the Cowboys a 23-18 lead heading into the fourth quarter.

Bell scored on a one-yard run midway through the fourth quarter to give Pittsburgh a 24-23 advantage. Elliott scored on a 14-yard run right after the two minute warning to give Dallas a 29-24 edge. Roethlisberger threw a 15-yard touchdown pass to WR **Antonio Brown** on a fake spike play on Pittsburgh's ensuing possession to give the Steelers a 30-29 lead.

But on Dallas' final drive, Elliott scored the game winning touchdown.

EAST RUTHERFORD, N.J. - There was one overriding reason QB Ben Roethlisberger worked so hard to return from a major elbow injury.

His team.

Roethlisberger, who missed the final 14 games last season after elbow surgery, threw for three scores and the Steelers beat the New York Giants 26-16 at an empty and eerie MetLife Stadium. He also got all the help he could ask for from his defense and backup RB Bennie Snell.

A key part of it, along with several defensive plays and Snell's 113 yards on 19 carries -- his first 100-yard performance in his second NFL season.

The defense, while not quite on the level of the famed Steel Curtain, was stingy and physical. It held Saquon Barkley to 6 yards on 15 carries, swarming in the backfield nearly all night.

Three Steelers stars got them their first touchdown. All-Pro LB T.J. Watt made a clever interception at the New York 36. Roethlisberger beat a blitz with a perfect throw to WR Juju Smith-Schuster for a 10-yard second-quarter score. K Chris Boswell's extra point hit the upright, leaving them behind 10-9.

They got the lead with 7 seconds remaining in the half as Roethlisberger connected with WR James Washington, who dived into the end zone for a 13-yard score. Boswell made the PAT this time, and added a 36-yard field goal early in the final quarter. That came following the night's biggest play.

Even though the Pittsburgh defense broke down as the Giants marched 87 yards on 19 plays in the third quarter, it still came up with a huge stop. LB Bud Dupree pressured quarterback Daniel Jones as he rolled left from the 4 and deflected his pass. DT Cam Heyward practically made a fair catch in the end zone for the interception.

Roethlisberger then took Pittsburgh 62 yards for the field goal and a 19-10 lead. He hit Smith-Schuster again for a 10-yard touchdown and a 26-10 lead before New York got a late TD.

Roethlisberger finished 21 of 32 for 229 yards has now thrown for 366 touchdowns, a franchise record, tying Eli Manning for the eighth most in NFL history.

PITTSBURGH -- They started strong but in the end they were hanging on. All the twists and turns made the Steelers' 26-21 victory over Denver this afternoon at Heinz Field less than aesthetically pleasing, but the final result sure beat the alternative.

"We were far from perfect," head coach Mike Tomlin assessed. "We gotta get better. We're thankful to win in spite of it.

The biggest play was made by SS Terrell Edmunds.

Edmunds' sack of Broncos backup quarterback Jeff Driskel on fourth-and-2 from the Steelers' 15-yard line with 1:51 left in the fourth quarter ended what turned out to be Denver's final possession.

The Broncos had driven from their 18 to the Steelers 15 but couldn't finish what could have been a game-stealing march.

RB James Conner's subsequent 59-yard burst allowed the Steelers to run out the clock.

A fumble by RB Benny Snell immediately after the Steelers' punt-return team had registered a safety opened the door for the Broncos to get back in the game.

Denver eventually turned that into a 16-yard touchdown pass from Driskell to running back Melvin Gordon that brought the Broncos to within 26-21.

QB Ben Roethlisberger finished 29-for-41 passing for 311 yards and two touchdowns, but he was also intercepted once (the Broncos turned that turnover into a field goal and a 17-6 third-quarter deficit) and directed an offense that converted just two of 12 third downs.

"I didn't play well and that's on me," he said.

In the early stages it was the Steelers' defense generating the turnovers and the Steelers' offense taking advantage.

The tone was set on Denver's second possession, when Steelers outside LB Bud Dupree sacked quarterback Drew Lock and forced a fumble that was recovered by CB Mike Hilton and returned 8 yards to the Steelers' 41.

Denver lost Lock (shoulder) for the remainder of the afternoon on the play, the first of five sacks registered by the Steelers in the first half.

The Steelers' offense responded with a nine-play, 59-yard drive in 3:19 for a 7-0 lead.

CB Joe Haden's interception of a Driskel pass that deflected off the hands of wide receiver Courtland Sutton and 24-yard return set the Steelers up at the Denver 11 with 1:58 left in the second quarter. But this time Conner lost 1 yard on third-and-1 from the Broncos' 2 and the Steelers settled for K Chris Boswell's 21-yard field goal and a 17-3 lead.

In between, the Steelers sprinkled in some spectacular via an 84-yard connection from Roethlisberger to rookie second-round WR Chase Claypool. Roethlisberger let it fly on first-and-10 from the Steelers' 16 and Claypool hauled the ball in over rookie third-round cornerback Michael Ojemudia, managed to navigate the sideline after coming down with it and sprinted the final 47 yards into the end zone.

Boswell's extra point gave the Steelers a 14-3 lead with 6:23 left in the half.

A 36-yard punt by P Dustin Colquitt and 9-yard return by Diontae Spencer started a Broncos' possession at the Steelers' 36 at the start of the second. Kicker Brandon McManus' 49-yard field goal drew Denver to within 7-3 five plays later.

And a stop by the Denver defense on fourth-and-2 from the Broncos' 35 (Roethlisberger threw incomplete for TE Eric Ebron) turned into a six-play, 65-yard drive that ended with a 20-yard touchdown pass to tight end Noah Fant and a two-point conversion to Fant that sliced the Steelers' lead to 17-14 with 1:07 left in the third.

The Steelers countered with a 28-yard touchdown pass from Roethlisberger to WR Diontae Johnson, and with a safety when Broncos punter Sam Martin fumbled a snap and the ball was eventually knocked out of the back of the end zone.

Roethlisberger broke a tie with Eli Manning and assumed sole possession of eighth place on the NFL's all-time touchdown passes list at 368.

His 311 passing yards moved him ahead of Manning and into seventh place all-time with 57,085.

PITTSBURGH – QB Ben Roethlisberger’s record-setting afternoon turned into a first-half shootout with Houston.

Roethlisberger appeared in his 221st regular-season game, which broke a tie with Hall-of-Fame center Mike Webster and elevated Roethlisberger into sole possession of first place on the Steelers’ all-time list.

The Steelers made it an occasion to celebrate with a 28-21 victory over the Texans.

The Steelers improved to 3-0.

What had been a back-and-forth exhibit of offense in the first two quarters turned into a slug-fest in the second half.

Trailing 21-20 in the fourth quarter, Roethlisberger directed a 12-play, 79-yard drive in 7:03 that ended on a 12-yard burst for a touchdown by RB James Conner and a pass for a two-point conversion from Roethlisberger to WR JuJu Smith-Schuster and a 28-21 Steelers’ lead with 6:24 left in regulation.

The Texans failed to manage a first down on their next possession and punted, and the Steelers exhausted the final 4:47 left on the clock.

Houston had put up 21 points and gained 209 total net yards in the first half.

The Steelers’ defense pitched a second-half shutout while limiting the Texans to 51 total net yards and two first downs, and coming up with the game’s only turnover, an interception by nickel CB Mike Hilton that set the table for what became the game-winning drive.

“They had a really good plan,” Steelers head coach Mike Tomlin said of the Texans. “It took us a while to get adjusted to it. It took us a while to find our rhythm.”

The Steelers had closed to within 21-20 on a 26-yard field goal from K Chris Boswell with 9:54 left in the third quarter. Their 12-play, 62-yard drive in 5:06 required a pair of fourth-down conversions, one a 2-yard effort by Conner to the Houston 48-yard line and one on a 29-yard pass interference penalty on a deep ball to WR Chase Claypool that set the Steelers up at the Texans’ 10.

The drive that closed out the game included a 7-yard pass from Roethlisberger to WR James Washington on fourth-and-1 from the Houston 35 with 3:11 left in the fourth

The Steelers responded to an early 14-3 deficit with consecutive touchdown drives for a 17-14 advantage.

Roethlisberger found TE Eric Ebron with a back shoulder-fade on third-and-goal from the Houston 10 with 5:05 left in the second quarter. Boswell’s extra point brought the Steelers to within 14-10.

The Steelers got the ball back 2:38 before the break and turned the possession into a seven-play, 63-yard march to a touchdown in 1:24. Smith-Schuster ran through the Houston secondary uncovered and walked into the end zone on a drive-capping, 26-yard catch-and-run touchdown. Boswell’s PAT made in 17-14 Steelers with 1:14 remaining in the second.

It took the Texans just 50 seconds to re-take the lead.

A five-play, 75-yard drive ended with a 14-yard fade from quarterback Deshaun Watson to wide receiver Will Fuller over CB Steven Nelson in the back of the end zone. Ka’imi Fairbairn’s extra point gave Houston a 21-17 lead with 24 seconds left before halftime.

PITTSBURGH — Rookie WR Chase Claypool, a native of Abbotsford, British Columbia, rushed for one touchdown and caught passes for three more scores and the Steelers broke open what had been a tight game at halftime and then hung on and outlasted the Eagles, 38-29, on Sunday afternoon at Heinz Field. Claypool tied a Steelers record for most touchdowns scored in a game with the four, and most points scored in a game with 24 (tying records set by Roy Jefferson, 1968, and Ray Mathews, 1954)

The Steelers improved to 4-0 for the first time since 1979 and for the fourth time in franchise history (1978, 1973).

The Eagles fell to 1-3-1.

Philadelphia trailed 31-29 and had a chance to grab a late lead but a 57-yard field goal attempt by kicker Jake Elliott missed wide right with 3:18 left in regulation.

The Steelers countered with a 35-yard touchdown pass from QB Ben Roethlisberger to Claypool with 2:59 left in the fourth quarter. Claypool's fourth touchdown of the day and K Chris Boswell's extra point turned the two-point lead into a nine-point advantage at 38-29.

Claypool finished with seven catches for 110 yards and three touchdowns, and three carries for 6 yards and a score. Claypool became the fourth rookie since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger with two receiving touchdowns and one rushing touchdown in the same game.

An announced crowd of 4,708 attended the first game fans were permitted to attend amid the pandemic. The Steelers lost G David DeCastro (abdomen) for the game after their initial touchdown drive.

DeCastro was replaced by rookie G Kevin Dotson.

WR Diontae Johnson went down and stayed down (back) after a 5-yard punt return at the end of Philadelphia's second possession and did not return.

C Maurkice Pouncey (foot) left for the locker room at the two-minute warning. Pouncey was replaced at center on the Steeler's game-ending possession by C J.C. Hassenauer.

PITTSBURGH-The Browns came to Heinz Field determined to challenge for first place in the AFC North Division but the Steelers had all the answers on Sunday afternoon at Heinz Field.

It all added up to a 38-7 Steelers' victory. "That was varsity ball today," Steelers head coach Mike Tomlin announced.

Mayfield, battling a rib injury at the outset he had officially been listed as "questionable/chest" watched the fourth quarter from the bench as the Steelers improved to 5-0 for the second time in franchise history.

"It was a good win, but I'm going to leave it at that," Steelers defensive tackle and defensive captain Cam Heyward said.

Down 24-7, the Browns went for a first down on fourth-and-1 from the Cleveland 29-yard line and 5:59 left in the third. Running back Kareem Hunt was engulfed for a 1-yard loss and the Steelers took over at the Browns' 28.

From there the Steelers ran the ball eight consecutive times on the way to re-establishing a 24-point lead at 31-7. The march included a 2-yard sneak by QB Ben Roethlisberger on fourth-and-1 from the Browns' 5 and a 3-yard touchdown run by WR Chase Claypool on a sweep.

The first big play was an interception and 33-yard return for a touchdown by FS Minkah Fitzpatrick on third-and-3 from the Cleveland 28 with 9:05 left in the first quarter.

"We needed to set the tone on defense," Fitzpatrick said. "A pick-six on the first (defensive) drive of the game is definitely a way to do it."

Added Tomlin: "I think it sent a message to them, third down wasn't going to be easy sledding today." The Eagles had converted 10 of 14 third-down attempts in the Steelers' 38-29 victory over Philadelphia on Oct. 11.

Cleveland went 1-for-12 on third down and 0-for-3 on fourth down. Mayfield was sacked four times and intercepted twice. And the Browns' No. 1 rushing offense was held to 75 yards on 22 carries, less than half of the 188.4 yards per game on the ground Cleveland had been amassing on average.

The Steelers rushed for 129 yards, including 101 on 20 carries by RB James Conner, and scored three touchdowns on the ground.

"At the end of the day it comes down to respect," Conner said. "We just want our respect."

NASHVILLE - A blowout became a nail-biter that wasn't decided until the final hold-your-breath seconds. Titans K Stephen Gostkowski missed wide right on a 45-yard field goal attempt with 14 seconds left in the fourth quarter and the Steelers held on to beat Tennessee, 27-24, on Sunday afternoon in Nashville.

The Steelers improved to 6-0.

Tennessee fell to 5-1.

"All we can say is we're 6-0," DT **Cam Heyward** offered. "It's a good win but there's a lot we have to improve on going forward."

Tennessee had trailed by 20 at 27-7 early in the third quarter but pulled to within three at 27-24 with 10:13 left in regulation.

RB Derrick Henry blasted home on first-and-goal from the Steelers' 1-yard line after a defensive holding penalty on FS **Minkah Fitzpatrick** on fourth-and-goal from the 1 had given Tennessee a fresh set of downs. Gostkowski's extra point brought the Titans to within a field goal of tying the game."

"No one's really satisfied after today," LB **T.J. Watt** said. "We gotta do a much better job in the second half." The Steelers held Henry to 75 yards on 20 carries a week after he had rushed for 212 yards against Houston.

Steelers RB **James Conner** out-gained Henry on the ground (20 carries, 82 yards) and the Steelers enjoyed a 36:37-23:23 advantage in time of possession and out-gained the Titans, 362-292. A big reason for the offense's success was a 13-for-18 performance converting third downs (72 percent). The Titans converted five of 13 third-down tries (38 percent).

Three interceptions thrown by Steelers QB **Ben Roethlisberger**, two off of deflections, were the only turnovers of the game.

"It wasn't always pretty," Roethlisberger said. "There were times it was but three interceptions is unacceptable. "At the end of the day, we got a win against a really good football team at their place."

The Steelers improved what had been a 17-point halftime advantage on their first possession of the third, which ended on a 30-yard field goal by K **Chris Boswell** that upped their lead to 27-7.

The Titans answered back with a two-play, 75-yard touchdown march comprised almost entirely by a 73-yard touchdown pass from QB Ryan Tannehill to WR A.J. Brown. The catch was made at the Tennessee 35, after which Brown eluded Fitzpatrick and was gone. Gostowski's extra point drew Tennessee to within 27-14.

The Titans crept back within to within 10 at 27-17 on a 51-yard Gostkowski field goal with 2:55 left in the third. Tennessee took over at the Steelers' 30 after a pass by Roethlisberger was tipped by DT Jeffery Simmons and intercepted by LB Jayon Brown. But the defense stiffened and forced the Gostkowski attempt after a sack of Tannehill for a 3-yard loss and a couple of incompletions.

The Steelers dominated on third downs in achieving a commanding lead in total net yards, time of possession and on the scoreboard through 30 minutes.

They opened by winning the coin toss, taking the ball and driving it 75 yards for a touchdown in 16 plays that consumed the game's first 9:18. The monster march ended on an 11-yard pass from Roethlisberger to WR **Diontae Johnson** and included conversions on third-and-3, third-and-11 and two third-and-1s. Boswell's extra point gave the Steelers a 7-0 lead with 5:42 left in the first quarter.

The Steelers' second possession resulted in a second touchdown and a 14-0 advantage.

This time the Steelers drive 61 yards in 13 plays and ate up 7:05. RB **Benny Snell** followed just-activated DL **Henry Mondeaux**, who had lined up at fullback, around left end for a 1-yard score on second-and-goal. The Steelers moved the chains on third-and-14, third-and-1 and third-and-12 on the way to the end zone. Boswell's extra point made it 14-0 Steelers with 12:16 left in the second quarter.

Tennessee countered with a 12-play, 75-yard touchdown drive in 6:50 that cut the Steelers' lead to 14-7. Tannehill finished it on third-and-goal with a 4-yard pass to WR Corey Davis with 5:26 left in the second.

The Steelers finally failed to convert on third down on their eighth opportunity (Roethlisberger threw incomplete for WR **JuJu Smith-Schuster**) and settled for a 38-yard field goal by Boswell that ended their third possession and upped their lead to 17-7 with 2:50 left prior to halftime.

The Steelers struck again after WR **Ray-Ray McCloud's** 57-yard punt return set up a first-and-10 at the Tennessee 17. Roethlisberger hit Johnson for another touchdown, this one a catch-and-run, 9-yard connection, on third-and-2. The Steelers' eighth third-down conversion in nine attempts and Boswell's third extra point upped the Steelers' lead to 24-7 with 52 seconds remaining before the break.

The Steelers out-gained the Titans, 228-83, and had a 19:56-10:04 advantage in time of possession in the first two quarters.

BALTIMORE -The Steelers started slowly but finished strong in Baltimore and improved to 7-0 with a 28-24 victory over the Ravens.

Baltimore fell to 5-2.

The game featured five lead changes, including three in the second half.

"This rivalry is what it is, man," Steelers head coach Mike Tomlin observed.

Nose tackle Isaiah Buggs, who was playing due to a knee injury sustained by Tyson Alualu early in the game, came off a block and started to take Ravens quarterback Lamar Jackson to the ground short of the line to gain on fourth-and-3 from the Steelers' 8-yard line just inside the two-minute warning. Free safety Minkah Fitzpatrick helped finish Jackson off on the play, which resulted in a fumble and a recovery by inside linebacker Robert Spillane.

The Steelers were unable to generate a first down and punted the ball back to the Ravens with 52 seconds left in regulation.

The Ravens took over at their 37-yard line and drove to the Steelers' 23 with eight seconds left in the fourth quarter but Fitzpatrick successfully defended Jackson's last-gasp pass into the end zone for wide receiver Willie Snead IV, with help from cornerback Justin Layne.

"This wasn't our best defensive performance," defensive end Stephon Tuitt acknowledged. "But those two drives we had to stop them on was what's most important."

Added Spillane: "We knew what it was going to take to win the game."

The Steelers rallied from a 24-21, fourth-quarter deficit with an eight-play, 80-yard drive in 4:27 that ended on an 8-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Ben Roethlisberger to wide receiver Chase Claypool. Kicker Chris Boswell's extra point gave the Steelers a 28-24 lead with 7:29 left in regulation.

The Ravens had re-taken the lead on their previous possession, an eight-play, 53-yard drive in 3:58 for a touchdown and a 24-21 advantage. Jackson finished the march with a 3-yard touchdown pass to wide receiver Marquise Brown. Kicker Justin Tucker converted with 11:56 left in the fourth.

The Steelers struck for two touchdowns on consecutive possessions in the third quarter that turned a 17-7 deficit into a 21-17 lead.

The first took advantage of a short field thanks to an interception by outside linebacker Alex Highsmith that set the Steelers up at the Ravens' 21 with 14:04 left in the third. Roethlisberger found tight end Eric

Ebron wide open on a shallow cross on second-and-7 from the Ravens' 18 and Ebron cruised untouched into the end zone. Boswell's extra point trimmed the Baltimore lead to 17-14 with 13:21 left in the third.

After the defense produced a three-and-out, the Steelers drove 77 yards in 10 plays for a touchdown and their second lead of the game.

Running back James Conner finished the possession with a 1-yard touchdown run. Roethlisberger had found wide receiver Juju Smith-Schuster for 14 yards on second-and-13 from the Ravens' 15 just prior to the TD. Boswell's extra point put the Steelers ahead, 21-17, with 5:38 left in the third.

The Steelers gained 157 of their 221 total net yards in the second half.

Baltimore rushed for 265 yards and had 457 total net yards but came up 23 short.

"They punched us in the mouth," Ebron said. "We had to make adjustments.

"We fought our (backside) off."

The Steelers didn't produce any points on offense and only held the ball for 9:51 in a first half that ended with a 51-yard field goal by Tucker that increased Baltimore's lead to 17-7. Baltimore took over at its 8 with 3:44 left in the second quarter and was able to convert three third downs on a 15-play, 59-yard drive that exhausted the remainder of the first half.

The Ravens had taken a 14-7 lead on a 1-yard touchdown run by running back Gus Edwards and Tucker's extra point with 7:24 left in the second quarter. Edwards' rumble into the end zone capped a nine-play, 80-yard drive in 5:18.

Baltimore tied the game at 7-7 on 6-yard touchdown pass from Jackson to wide receiver Miles Boykin and a Tucker extra point with 8:48 left in the first quarter. The Ravens moved 75 yards in nine plays and ate up 5:22 on their second possession of the game.

Baltimore's first possession on the afternoon ended on an interception and 33-yard return for a touchdown by Spillane. Boswell's extra point gave the Steelers a 7-0 lead just 54 seconds into the game.

The Ravens went 5-for-8 on third downs and gained 254 total net yards, including 179 on the ground, while possessing the ball for 20:09 in the first two quarters.

The Steelers allowed an average of 68.8 yards against on the ground over their first six games.

The Steelers went 0-for-3 on third downs and had 64 total net yards in the first 30 minutes.
