### STEELERS HEAD WEST

- Pittsburgh will travel to the Pacific time zone for the second consecutive year. The Steelers played at Oakland in 2018.
- Pittsburgh owns a 19-40 (.322) all-time record against teams that comprise the Pacific time zone (Los Angeles Rams, Oakland/Los Angeles Raiders, San Diego/Los Angeles Chargers, San Francisco 49ers and Seattle Seahawks).
- The Steelers are 8-6 (.571) all-time at San Diego/Los Angeles Chargers.

### STEELERS NAME FOUR TEAM CAPTAINS

- The Steelers selected four players to serve as team captains for the 2019 season, the team announced through a vote of their teammates.
- QB Ben Roethlisberger** and **C Maurkice Pouncey** serve as the offensive captains, **DT Cameron Heyward** serves as the defensive captain and **FB Roosevelt Nix** serves as the special teams captain.
- Roethlisberger was selected as an offensive captain for the 11th time in his career (2008-09, 2011-18). This marks Heyward's fifth consecutive year as a captain (2015-19), and the third time Pouncey has been named a captain (2013, 2018-19).
- Nix was named a captain for the first time in his career.

### SCHEDULE NOTES

- The Steelers are slated to appear in five nationally-televised primetime games, including two Monday Night Football games at Heinz Field, during the NFL's 2019 regular season, it was announced this past spring when the NFL unveiled its 2019 regular season schedule.
- Pittsburgh kicked off its 2019 regular season on Sunday Night Football at the New England Patriots in Week 1 on Sunday, Sept. 8 (NBC, 8:20 p.m.). The Steelers hosted the Seattle Seahawks in Week 2 of the 2019 regular season at Heinz Field for their home opener on Sunday, Sept. 15 (FOX, 1 p.m.).
- The Steelers twice appear on Monday Night Football at Heinz Field in 2019 (ESPN, 8:15 p.m.), in Weeks 4 (Cincinnati Bengals) and 8 (Miami Dolphins), respectively. Pittsburgh's two other nationally televised primetime games are scheduled for Sunday Night Football at the Los Angeles Chargers in Week 6 on Oct. 13 (NBC, 8:20 p.m.) and a Thursday Night Football game at the Cleveland Browns in Week 11 on Nov. 14 (FOX/NFL Network/Amazon, 8:20 p.m.).
- The Steelers' bye week will be on Oct. 20 (Week 7).

## DEFENSIVE RESURGENCE

- Over its first two games of 2019, Pittsburgh allowed 61 points (fifth worst in the NFL), seven TDs (tied for fifth worst), 75.0 opposing completion percentage (fourth worst) and 131.3 opposing passer rating (fourth worst).
- Over their last three games of 2019, the Steelers have allowed 53 points (ninth best in the NFL), five TDs (tied for fifth best) and 63.5 opposing passer rating (third best).
- Pittsburgh has forced 10 turnovers (best) and recorded 14 sacks (third), 17 passes defended and 26 quarterback hits over its last three games.

- Pittsburgh forced three more turnovers vs. Baltimore. The Steelers have forced 12 turnovers over their last four games.
- The Steelers picked off three passes vs. Baltimore, which marked the first time Pittsburgh had three interceptions in a game since Sept. 24, 2018 at Tampa Bay.
- Pittsburgh limited the Ravens to just 277 total yards and 3.8 yards/play. Baltimore entered the game averaging 482.5 total yards/game and 6.7 yards/play.
- Seven of Baltimore's 12 offensive drives gained 15 yards or less.

## WINNING ERA OF FREE AGENCY

- Pittsburgh has the second-best regular-season record in the NFL during the free agency era, since 1993, with a 264-155-2 (.629) mark.
- The Steelers are one of three teams (New England, 289; Green Bay, 262) with at least 250 regular season wins since 1993.

## TOMLIN AT HEINZ FIELD

- Mike Tomlin** has guided Pittsburgh to a 71-28 (.717) regular-season record at Heinz Field.
- Tomlin earned his 50th regular-season home win in Week 9 in 2015 vs. Oakland and joined **Chuck Noll** (119) and **Bill Cowher** (85) as the third head coach in Steelers history with 50 regular season home victories.
- Tomlin has led Pittsburgh to at least five home wins in each of his first 12 seasons as the team's head coach and six home wins in eight of his first 12 at the helm.
- His 71-28 (.717) record and 71 home victories are each third best in the NFL since 2007.

## 2019 STEELERS HALL OF HONOR

The Pittsburgh Steelers announced their **2019 Hall of Honor** class on July 27 at an event at the Fred Rogers Center on the campus of Saint Vincent College.

The 2019 class includes the following (in alphabetical order):

### Larry Brown: Tight End/Tackle (1971-84)

- Spent 14 seasons with the Pittsburgh Steelers, including the first seven as a tight end before moving to tackle for the final seven years with the team.
- Drafted in the first round by the Steelers in the 1971 NFL Draft and would go on to make three Pro Bowls.
- One of only 22 players to win four Super Bowls during the 1970s dynasty.
- Caught a 4-yard touchdown pass from Terry Bradshaw late in the fourth quarter to seal the Steelers' victory in Super Bowl IX.
- Member of the Steelers' All-Time Team.

### Bill Cowher: Head Coach (1992-2006)

- During his 15 seasons as Head Coach, the team won 149 games, eight division titles and made 10 playoff appearances.
- The team won the division in each of his first six seasons as Head Coach.
- Led the Steelers to the Super Bowl twice, including a 21-10 victory over the Seattle Seahawks in Super Bowl XL.
- A Pittsburgh native, named the Associated Press NFL Coach of the Year in his first season (1992).

### Elbie Nickel: Tight End (1947-57)

- Drafted by the Steelers in 1947 and finished his career with 329 receptions.
- His 329 receptions rank second in team history for a tight end.
- Scored 37 career touchdowns, the eighth-most in Steelers history.
- Led the League in yards-per-catch in 1949 with a 24.3 average.
- Member of the Steelers' All-Time Team.

### Hines Ward: Wide Receiver (1998-2011)

- Drafted by the Steelers in the third round of the 1998 NFL Draft.
- Became the team's all-time leader in receptions, receiving yards and receiving touchdowns.
- Named MVP of Super Bowl XL after catching five passes for 123 yards and the game-clinching 43-yard touchdown catch.
- Arguably the best blocking wide receiver in NFL history.
- Two-time Super Bowl champion (Super Bowls XL and XLIII) and four-time Pro Bowl selection.
- Member of the Steelers' All-Time Team.

The 2019 Steelers Hall of Honor Induction ceremony was held on Sunday, Sept. 29, at Heinz Field, the weekend the Steelers hosted the Cincinnati Bengals on Monday Night Football (Sept. 30). Each inductee received a replica of a solid steel football, which replicated the original that was given to Steelers' founder Arthur J. Rooney Sr. by the United States Steel Corporation and United Steel Workers in 1982 on the occasion of the team's 50th Season.

The Steelers' Hall of Honor, established in 2017, is comprised of former players, coaches, and front office personnel who were integral in creating and sustaining the franchise's success dating back to when the team was founded in 1933.

The Hall of Honor Selection Committee consists of Steelers President Art Rooney II, Joe Gordon, Bob Labriola, Stan Savran, Andrew Stockey, and Tony Quatrini.

## TOMLIN'S 100 WINS IN 10 SEASONS

- **Mike Tomlin** became the third head coach in Steelers history to record 100 regular-season wins in Week 14 of 2016, with the team's 27-20 victory at Buffalo.
- Tomlin joined **Chuck Noll** (1969-91, 193) and **Bill Cowher** (1992-2006, 149) in the team's 100-win club. The Steelers became the first NFL franchise with three 100-win head coaches.
- Tomlin earned his 100th regular-season victory in his 157th career regular-season game, which marked the fewest games by a Steelers head coach to reach the century mark (**Chuck Noll**, 158; **Bill Cowher**, 163).
- Tomlin's 100th win occurred in his 10th season with the Steelers, becoming the first Pittsburgh head coach to reach 100 wins in his first 10 years (**Bill Cowher**, 1992-2001, 99; **Chuck Noll**, 1976-78, 88).
- Tomlin also joined an elite NFL head coach fraternity by reaching 100 wins in his 10th season,
- Tomlin is the ninth head coach in NFL history to win 100 games in his first 10 seasons with one franchise, joining Bill Belichick (New England), Mike Ditka (Chicago), Joe Gibbs (Washington), John Madden (Oakland), Mike McCarthy (Green Bay), Marty Schottenheimer (Kansas City), Mike Shanahan (Denver) and Don Shula (Miami).

## AMONG COACHES IN FIRST 10 YEARS

- **Mike Tomlin** earned his 100th regular-season victory in Week 14 at Buffalo in 2016, and accumulated a 103-57 regular-season record in his first 10 seasons as a head coach in NFL (2007-16).
- Tomlin became the eighth head coach in NFL history with 100 or more regular-season wins in their first 10 seasons as a head coach:

## DEVLIN HODGES HASN'T DUCKED COMPETITION

- **QB Devlin Hodges** was the all-time leader in career passing yards in FCS history with 14,584 career passing yards, which broke the old FCS national record of 14,496, set by Steve McNair (Alcorn State 1991-94). He received the 2018 Walter Payton Award as the top offensive player in all of FCS football.
- Hodges caught the attention of many following a record-setting performance and near upset of Florida State. He finished with 475 passing yards, including 317 in the first half, and became the first opposing player to rack up 400-plus yards of offense against the Seminoles since Clemson quarterback Deshaun Watson in 2016.
- Hodges set a school record for single-season passing yards, throwing for 4,283 yards during his senior season in 2018. He had six games that season in which he threw for at least 400 yards. Hodges won his third-straight Southern Conference Offensive Player of the Year honor in '18.
- Undrafted, Pittsburgh signed Hodges shortly after the 2019 draft. Hodges earned the final spot on the quarterback depth chart following the Steelers' rookie minicamp.
- Hodges didn't make Pittsburgh's initial 53-man roster but was added to the Steelers' practice squad after clearing waivers on Sept. 10.
- Hodges was then promoted to the 53-man roster on Sept. 16 following the season-ending injury to **QB Ben Roethlisberger**.

## HODGES MAKES HISTORY

- **QB Devlin Hodges** made his NFL debut vs. Baltimore (Oct. 6) following an injury to **QB Mason Rudolph**.
- On his first career drive, Hodges completed 2 of 3 passes for 27 yards on the 10-play, 87-yard go-ahead TD march that gave Pittsburgh a 20-17 lead with 3:42 remaining in the third quarter.
- Hodges is the first Samford QB to appear in a professional football game since Jimmy Tarrant of the 1946 Miami Seahawks.
- Hodges is the first undrafted Steelers rookie with multiple completions in a single game since QB Tony Dungy on Oct. 9, 1977 at Houston.
- Hodges finished the game vs. Baltimore having completed 7 of 9 passes for 68 yards. He also added 20 yards rushing, including a game-high 21-yard scamper on the fourth-quarter go-ahead scoring drive.

## HODGES, RUDOLPH POSSIBLE SIMILAR DEBUTS

- **QB Mason Rudolph** made his first career NFL start (at San Francisco on Sept. 22) in his second career NFL game.
- If **QB Devlin Hodges** were to start this week at Los Angeles Chargers, he'd also make his first career start in his second career NFL game.
- If Hodges were to start, Pittsburgh would be the 11th team since the 1970 NFL-AFL merger to have a pair of quarterbacks make their respective career starting debuts over the first six weeks of a season.

- Eight of the previous 11 occurrences came during the 1987 season, which featured the NFL strike and replacement players.
- Pittsburgh could become the first NFL team to have a pair of quarterbacks make their respective starting debuts in the same season since Cleveland in 2014. The Browns started Johnny Manziel vs. Cincinnati in Week 15 and Connor Shaw at Baltimore in Week 17.
- Pittsburgh could become the first NFL team to have a pair of quarterbacks make their respective starting debuts in the first six weeks of the same season since Dallas in 1989. The Cowboys started Steve Walsh in Week 5 at Green Bay and Troy Aikman in Week 1 at New Orleans.

## STEELERS ADD S MINKAH FITZPATRICK

- The Steelers traded for S **Minkah Fitzpatrick** from the Miami Dolphins in exchange for draft picks in the upcoming NFL Drafts. As part of the trade, the Steelers acquire Fitzpatrick along with the Dolphins fourth-round selection in the 2020 NFL Draft and their seventh-round pick in the 2021 NFL Draft. In exchange, the Steelers have given up their first-round and fifth-round picks in the 2020 NFL Draft and their sixth-round pick in the 2021 NFL Draft.
- In 2018 Fitzpatrick was one of just eight rookies with 50+ tackles and an interception, and one of just seven with 50+ tackles and 5+ passes defended.
- Fitzpatrick played three different positions – safety, boundary corner and slot corner – for the Dolphins defense.
- Fitzpatrick's 79 tackles in 2018 were 10th among rookies while his seven passes defended were tied for sixth.
- Fitzpatrick was selected by the Dolphins in the first round of the 2018 NFL Draft, the 11th pick overall.
- Fitzpatrick had 5 tackles in the Dolphins season opener against Baltimore and added 6 tackles against New England last week, with a forced fumble and fumble recovery.
- A three-year starter at Alabama, he played in 42 games, starting 38. He had 171 tackles, including 109 solo stops, 4.5 sacks, nine interceptions, 35 pass defenses and two forced fumbles. He won the Jim Thorpe Award as the nation's top defensive back his final season and became the third player in NCAA history to win both the Chuck Bednarik and Jim Thorpe Awards, joining Charles Woodson and Patrick Peterson with that honor. He was also a unanimous first-team All-American in 2017.

## FITZPATRICK MAKES IMMEDIATE IMPACT

- S **Minkah Fitzpatrick** made quite a Steelers debut against San Francisco (Sept. 22).
- Fitzpatrick was the first Pittsburgh player to have an interception and forced fumble in the same game since William Gay vs. Indianapolis on Nov. 24, 2016.
- Fitzpatrick recorded his third career interception and first as a member of the Steelers.
- Fitzpatrick registered a forced fumble early in the second quarter.
- Fitzpatrick is the sixth Steelers defensive back to force a fumble and intercept a pass in the same game since 1993.

## RUDOLPH SHINES IN HOME STARTING DEBUT

- In first NFL home start (and second start overall), **QB Mason Rudolph** completed 24 of 28 passes for 229 yards and two TDs against Cincinnati (Sept. 30).
- Rudolph set or equaled franchise records for a QB in his first career home start in completions (24), completion percentage (85.7), TD passes (tied, 2) and QB rating (124.6).
- Rudolph's 85.7 completion percentage against the Bengals was tied with **QB Ben Roethlisberger** (85.7 vs. Miami, Nov. 26, 2007) for the third-highest in franchise history (only Roethlisberger has exceeded Rudolph's effort from Monday night -- 88.0% vs. Carolina on Nov. 8, 2018 and 86.2% vs. Oakland on Dec. 9, 2018).
- Rudolph posted his third consecutive game with at least two TD passes (one of only two QBs in the NFL with a streak of at least three games -- Jacoby Brissett of the Indianapolis Colts has two TD passes in four straight games).
- Rudolph completed 17 of 18 passes for 133 yards and one TD in the opening half against Cincinnati.
- Rudolph completed each of his first seven passes against the Bengals -- five of which went to different receivers.
- Rudolph connected with **RB James Conner** on a 21-yard TD pass with 10:39 remaining in the second quarter, which gave the Steelers a 7-3 lead over Cincinnati.
- Rudolph hooked up with **WR Diontae Johnson** on a 43-yard TD pass with 9:32 remaining in the third quarter, which gave the Steelers a 24-3 lead over the Bengals.

## RUDOLPH/ROETHLISBERGER SIMILAR IN NFL DEBUTS

- In 2004 QB Tommy Maddox was injured in Week 2, and the injury happened on the fifth play of the third quarter. In his first NFL game, QB **Ben Roethlisberger** completed 12-of-20 (60 percent) for 171 yards, with two touchdowns, two interceptions, and a rating of 82.5.
- In 2019 QB **Mason Rudolph** started the second half against Seattle (Sept. 15), and he completed 12-of-19 (63.2 percent) for 112 yards, with two touchdowns, one interception, and a rating of 92.4.

- Rudolph collected TD passes of 76 and 39-yards
- Rudolph is just the fifth quarterback in the NFL to throw for multiple TDs in his first career start (which came on the road) since 2016.

## CONNER STRONG

- **RB James Conner** set career-highs in both receptions (8) and receiving yards (83) in the rout of Cincinnati on Sept. 30. His previous career-highs in receptions (7 at Baltimore on Nov. 4, 2018) and receiving yards (75 vs. Atlanta on Oct. 7, 2018) both came last season.
- Conner hauled in a 21-yard TD reception from **QB Mason Rudolph** with 10:39 left in the second quarter, which gave the Steelers a 7-3 lead over the Bengals.
- The TD catch was Conner's first of the season and the second of his career.
- Conner rushed for 55 yards on 14 carries, including a 1-yard TD run, vs. Baltimore on Oct. 6. He registered his second rushing TD of the season and 14th of his career.
- It marked the ninth time in the last 14 games that Conner recorded at least one TD.
- Conner has 14 rushing touchdowns since the start of the 2018 season, which ranks fifth in the NFL:

- Conner became the first player in team history with at least 1,000 scrimmage yards and 10 TDs in the team's first eight games of a season (2018), and scored at least one TD in five straight games (Games 5-9).
- Conner recorded three straight games with at least 100 rushing yards and two TDs in three consecutive games in 2018 (Games 5-7), becoming the first player in Steelers history – and the first NFL player since 2009 (Chris Johnson) – to tally three straight games with at least 100 rushing yards and two TDs.
- Conner rushed for nine TDs in the first eight games of 2018, tied for the most by a Steeler through the first eight games of a season (Franco Harris, 1976) and his 1,085 yards from scrimmage were the second-most through eight games of a season in team history (Le'Veon Bell, 1,086; 2014).

- Conner made the first start of his NFL career and set single-game career-highs for rushing yards (135), TDs (2 rushing) and scrimmage yards (192) on Kickoff Weekend of 2018 at Cleveland. He added 5 receptions for 57 yards.
- Conner's 135 rushing yards marked the first 100-yard rushing game of his NFL career and the fourth-most by a Steeler on Kickoff Weekend, while his 192 scrimmage yards were the third-most by a Steeler on Kickoff Weekend in team history.
- Conner totaled 65 yards from scrimmage (17 rushing / 48 receiving) and scored his third career rushing TD and of 2018, and his first as a Steeler at Heinz Field, on a 1-yard run, in Week 2 against Kansas City.
- In Week 5 vs. Atlanta at Heinz Field, Conner tallied 185 yards from scrimmage (110 rushing / 75 receiving), to go along with two rushing TDs. He became the second Steeler to record at least 100 rushing yards, 75 receiving yards and two rushing TDs in a game since 1950, joining Franco Harris (Nov. 25, 1979 vs. Cleveland).

## CONNER'S HONORS

- **RB James Conner** earned 2018 AFC Offensive Player of the Week (Week 8) and 2018 AFC Offensive Player of the Month (October) honors.
- In Week 8 of 2018, Conner led all players in multiple categories, including yards from scrimmage (212), rushing yards (146) and rushing TDs (2), adding 5 catches for 66 yards in Week 8's win vs. Cleveland at Heinz Field.
- Conner led the AFC in rushing TDs (6), yards from scrimmage per game (175.3), rushing yards per game (122.3) and rushes of 10+ yards (13) in the month of October, while rushing for at least 100 yards and two TDs in each of his three October games – becoming the first player in Steelers history with a three-game streak of at least 100-rushing yards and two rushing TDs and the first NFL player to do so since 2009.
- This marked the second time that Conner has taken home AFC honors in 2018 (Offensive Player of the Week: Week 8).





### SAMUELS' SWISS ARMY KNIFE

- **RB Jaylen Samuels** completed three passes, all out of the wildcat formation to **RB James Conner**, for 31 yards in the 27-3 rout of Cincinnati on Sept. 30.
- Samuels was the second player with 3 completions, 3 rushes and 3 catches in a game since the 1970 NFL-AFL merger, joining Terrelle Pryor in 2016.
- Samuels added 26 yards rushing, including a 2-yard TD run, and eight receptions for 57 yards (both career highs).
- Samuels was the first Pittsburgh running back with a completion, rush attempt and reception in the same game since Mewelde Moore in Week 4 of 2009 against the San Diego Chargers (Oct. 4).
- Samuels' 2-yard TD run, which was the first of his career, with 10:36 left in the third quarter gave the Steelers a 17-3 lead over the Bengals.
- Samuels was the first Steelers non-QB with multiple completions in a game since Antwaan Randle El in 2005.
- Samuels registered his first career pass attempt and pass completion on the Steelers' second drive of the game. The direct snap and ensuing pass play to Conner went for seven yards and a first down.

### MCDONALD'S CAREER YEAR

- **TE Vance McDonald**, who recorded single-season career bests in receptions (50) and receiving yards (610) in 2018, set a single-game career high, and registered the first 100-receiving yard game of his NFL regular season career, with 112 receiving yards on four catches in Week 3 of 2018 at Tampa Bay on Monday Night Football.
- McDonald became the second Steelers tight end since 1960, to record at least 100 receiving yards in the first half of a game (Eric Green, Sept. 22, 1991, 118 yards).
- McDonald scored a touchdown on a 75-yard pass from **QB Ben Roethlisberger** in the first quarter, matching a career-long reception (75-yard TD while with San Francisco) in 2016 (Sept. 18 at Carolina).
- In Week 6 at Cincinnati, McDonald set a single-game career best with seven catches (6, Nov. 29, 2015 vs. Arizona, while with San Francisco) for 68 yards.
- McDonald registered his first career multi-TD receiving game vs. Seattle on Sept. 15. He also equaled his career-high of seven catches.
- McDonald has recorded 14 career receiving TDs, which ranks tied for 21st in the NFL among active tight ends.

### NO DAYS OFF

- **OL Alejandro Villanueva** extended his consecutive regular-season games played streak to 69, which is tied for the third-longest active streak among active NFL offensive tackles:

- **LB T.J. Watt** either leads or is tied for the team high in sacks (3.5), tackles for loss (6.0), quarterback hits (10), interceptions (1) and forced fumbles (1).
- Watt's 6.0 tackles for loss and 10 quarterback hits each rank tied for fourth in the NFL.
- registered 1.5 sacks, three QB hits, one fumble recovery and one tackle for loss in the 27-3 rout of Cincinnati on Sept. 30.
- Watt's fumble recovery, his second of the season, stopped a second-quarter Bengals' drive inside the Pittsburgh 30-yard line.
- Watt recorded five tackles, 1.0 sack and 3.0 tackles for loss vs. Baltimore on Oct. 6. The 3.0 tackles for loss are his second most in a game (career best of 4.0 came on Sept. 9, 2018 at Cleveland).
- Watt recorded a sack and forced fumble against Seattle on Sept. 15.
- Watt has recorded eight forced fumbles in his career.

## WATT'S 2018 CAMPAIGN

- With a 2.0 sack outing at Jacksonville in Week 11 of 2018, **LB T.J. Watt** became the first Steelers linebacker with at least 10.0 sacks in a season since 2010 (James Harrison and LaMarr Woodley).
- Along with 7.0 sacks in his 2017 rookie campaign, Watt is the first Steelers linebacker since 2013-14 (Jason Worilds) to record back-to-back seasons with at least 7.0 sacks.
- Watt finished Week 1 in Cleveland with 10 tackles (7 solo), 3.0 sacks (minus 16 yards) and a blocked field goal. He was named AFC Defensive Player of the Week for his Week 1 outing, becoming the first Steelers linebacker since 2010 (Lawrence Timmons, Week 6) to receive the honor.
- Watt posted his second career and second game of 2018 with 3.0 sacks in Week 5 vs. Atlanta, the third multi-sack game of his NFL career. He forced a fumble on his third sack of Atlanta QB Matt Ryan, in the fourth quarter, which was recovered by LB L.J. Fort in the Falcons' end zone for a touchdown.
- In the Steelers' regular-season finale vs. Cincinnati at Heinz Field, Watt totaled 7 tackles (4 solo) and two defensive forced fumbles on Cincinnati QB Jeff Driskel, including a strip-sack of Driskel (minus 6 yards) at the Bengals' 12-yard line in the third quarter. His defensive forced fumbles marked the fifth and sixth defensive forced fumbles of his 2018 season and increased his career total to seven to become the first Steeler with at least six defensive forced fumbles in a season since 2010 (James Harrison: 6).

## WATT WITH 20.0 SACKS IN FIRST TWO NFL SEASONS

- LB T.J. Watt** recorded 20.0 quarterback sacks over his first two seasons in the NFL. He became the ninth linebacker with at least 20.0 sacks in a player's first two campaigns since the statistic became official in 1982.

## WATT IN 2017 ROOKIE YEAR

- LB T.J. Watt** - the Steelers' first round selection the 2017 NFL Draft - recorded 52 tackles (39 solo), 7.0 sacks, 10 tackles for losses, 12 quarterback hits, eight passes defended, an interception, a forced fumble and blocked a field goal attempt in 15 games played, all starts, in his 2017 rookie season.
- Watt's 7.0 sacks topped the 2017 NFL rookie linebacker class - tied for second among all NFL rookies - and are the second-most by a rookie in Steelers history (Kendrell Bell, 2001: 9.0):

- Watt started his regular-season career in historical fashion. He became the first player to record at least 2.0 sacks and an interception in an NFL debut on Kickoff Weekend since sacks became an official statistic in 1982, finishing with 6 tackles, 2.0 sacks, two tackles for losses, one quarterback hit and one interception.
- With his 2.0 sack and one interception performance, Watt became the third player in NFL history to record 2.0 sacks and an interception in an NFL debut, joining Charles Glaze (Oct. 4, 1987) and Tommy Haynes (Oct. 4, 1987).
- Watt became the first Steeler with at least 2.0 sacks in their NFL debut since sacks became an official statistic in 1982 (previous mark, 1.5, Kenny Davidson, Sept. 9, 1990 at Cleveland).
- Watt became the first Steeler with at least 2.0 sacks and an interception in the same game since 2010 (LaMarr Woodley, Dec. 12 vs. Cincinnati).

## HEYWARD SACK NOTES

- DT Cameron Heyward** is tied for the team lead in sacks (3.5) and tied for third in both tackles for loss (4.0) and quarterback hits (5).
- Heyward's 3.5 sacks are the second most of any defensive tackle in the NFL.
- Heyward's 4.0 tackles for loss are tied for the fourth most of any defensive tackle in the NFL.
- Heyward's 5 quarterback hits are tied for the third most of any defensive tackle in the NFL.
- Heyward recorded 4 tackles, 1.0 for loss, 1.0 sack and 2 QB hits vs. Baltimore on Oct. 6.
- Heyward collected six tackles, 2.5 sacks, three QB hits, one tackle for loss and one forced fumble in the 27-3 rout of Cincinnati on Sept. 30.
- Heyward's 2.5 sacks were the most in a single-game since he registered a career-high 3.0 vs. Kansas City (Oct. 2, 2016).
- Heyward recorded his eighth career game with at least 2.0 sacks against Cincinnati.
- The Steelers are now 8-0 when Heyward collects at least 2.0 sacks in a game.
- Heyward recorded 8.0 sacks in 2018, tied for the sixth-most among all NFL defensive tackles.
- Heyward recorded at least a half-sack in three consecutive games (Weeks 10-12), and recovered a fumble forced by **LB T.J. Watt** on a sack of Jacksonville QB Blake Bortles on the final play of regulation in the team's 20-16 win in Week 11.

- Bush became the first Steelers rookie with two fumble recoveries in the same game since at least 1950.







### HARGRAVE AT THE NOSE

- **NT Javon Hargrave** finished 12th among all NFL defensive tackles with 6.5 sacks in 2018.
- Hargrave produced the first multi-sack game of his NFL career, bringing down Jacksonville QB Blake Bortles (minus five and eight yards) twice in the second quarter in Week 11.
- Hargrave extended his single-season career high to 6.5 sacks in 2018 with a sack in Week 13 vs. Los Angeles, (2016 and 2017: 2.0), and his career quarterback takedown total to 10.5.

### WILLIAMS ON THE 'D'

- **LB Vince Williams** returned to the lineup vs. Baltimore on Oct. 6 after missing each of the previous two games with a hamstring injury.
- Williams recorded a team-high 9 tackles, 1.0 sack, 1.0 tackle for loss, 1 QB hit and 1 pass defended against the Ravens. He picked up his first sack of the season and 16th of his career.
- Williams led all players with 12 tackles (4 solo), including a tackle for a loss in Week 1 of 2018 at Cleveland. His 12 tackles marked the second double-digit tackle game of his NFL career (15, Oct. 2, 2016 vs. Kansas City).
- In Week 6 at Cincinnati, Williams led the Steelers with 7 total tackles (6 solo) and tallied his first sack of the season.
- In Week 10 vs. Carolina, Williams totaled 4 tackles (3 solo), including a sack of eight yards of Carolina QB Cam Newton. He picked off Newton in the first quarter, his second career interception, and returned it 17 yards for a TD to mark the first pick-six of his NFL career.
- Williams finished second on the Steelers' defense with 76 total tackles (50 solo) in 2018, and added 4.5 sacks and 8 tackles for losses, 10 quarterback hits, two passes defended and an interception returned for a touchdown.

### DO IT, TUITT

- **DL Stephon Tuitt** is tied for the team lead in both sacks (3.5) and tackles for loss (6.0). He also ranks second in quarterback hits (6).
- Tuitt ranks tied for fourth in the NFL in tackles for loss.

- Haden hauled in his third interception as a Steeler, picking off New England QB Tom Brady in the fourth quarter at the Steelers' 4-yard line in Week 15, his the 22nd interception of his NFL career and his second in 2018. Haden led all defenders in the game with a game high 12 total tackles (8 solo), two passes defended to go along with his interception.
- Haden, a two-time Pro Bowl selection, made his Steelers debut, appearing in the 91st game of his NFL regular-season career and posted six tackles and 1.0 sack, on Kickoff Weekend of 2017 at the Cleveland Browns. He brought down Cleveland QB DeShone Kizer for a sack of three yards to end the first half – his first sack with the Steelers – third of his NFL career – and first since Sept. 11, 2011 (with Cleveland).
- In Week 7 vs. Cincinnati, Haden hauled in the 20th interception of his NFL career and his first as a Steeler, picking off Cincinnati QB Andy Dalton in the third quarter.
- The University of Florida product was a first-round (seventh overall) draft selection of the Browns in 2010. He has started 108-of-117 games played in the NFL and his career numbers include 459 tackles (374 solo), 22 interceptions, 120 passes defended, five forced fumbles, four fumble recoveries and 3.0 sacks.

### HILTON MAGIC

- **CB Mike Hilton** registered his fourth career interception and first of the season vs. Baltimore on Oct. 6. The interception gave the Steelers great field position late in the second quarter. Pittsburgh opened the ensuing drive at the Ravens' 25-yard line.
- Hilton led Pittsburgh's defense with 8 total tackles (6 solo), 2 tackles for losses and a quarterback hit, along with a sack and defensive fumble recovery in Week 14 of 2018 at Oakland. He recorded a sack of Oakland QB Derek Carr (minus 6 yards) in the second quarter, his first quarterback takedown of 2018 and the fifth of his NFL career, and recovered a fumble off of a team sack in the third quarter.
- He picked off Tampa Bay QB Ryan Fitzpatrick in the second quarter of a Week 3 Monday Night Football game at Tampa Bay at the Pittsburgh's 6-yard line – his first interception of 2018 – and the third of his NFL career. He also recovered a fumble in the second quarter, marking the first defensive fumble recovery of his NFL career.
- Hilton joined the Steelers' practice squad in December of 2016, and started four-of-16 games played with Pittsburgh in 2017, recording 54 tackles (42 solo), 4.0 sacks, two interceptions, eight quarterback hits and 10 tackles for losses and six passes defended.

**DEFENSIVE ADDITIONS'**

- Pittsburgh signed two key additions to the defense this offseason, adding from **CB Steven Nelson** the Chiefs and **LB Mark Barron** from the Rams.
- In his five-year NFL career, four with Kansas City, Nelson has started 39-of-53 regular-season games. He also started four-of-six postseason games with the Chiefs. His career totals include 177 tackles (151 solo), four interceptions, 35 passes defended, 8 tackles for losses, two fumble recoveries and one forced fumble.
- In 104 regular-season games (93 starts) starts with Tampa Bay (2012-14) and the Los Angeles Rams (2014-18), Barron, the University of Alabama product has career totals including 630 tackles (485 solo), 9.0 sacks, eight interceptions, 39 passes defended, 17 quarterback hits, 44 tackles for losses, five forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries.

**WIZARD OF BOZ**

- K Chris Boswell** has made each of his 10 field goal attempts this season, including 4 of 40+ yards.
- Boswell is one of three kickers in the NFL that has yet to miss a field goal with 10 or more attempts.
- Since joining the Steelers in 2015, Boswell is 108-of-125 overall on field goal attempts (86.4%), including 38-of-48 (79.2%) between 40-49 yards.
- Boswell converted all three of his field goal attempts vs. Baltimore on Oct. 6, which marked his 19th career game with three or more field goals made.
- Boswell hit a pair of field goals at San Francisco on Sept. 22.
- Boswell connected on a pair of field goals vs. Seattle on Sept. 15.
- Against Cincinnati on Sept. 30, Boswell hit at least two field goals for the third consecutive week.
- Boswell converted a 48-yard field goal with 2:30 remaining in regulation, increasing the Steelers' lead to 17-10, in Week 16 against New England in 2018.

**PITTSBURGH** — The Steelers lost an overtime heartbreaker, falling to the Ravens, 26-23.

The loss dropped the Steelers to 1-4 on the season

The team also lost **QB Mason Rudolph**, who suffered a concussion in the game. Rudolph left Heinz Field during the game to be further evaluated at the hospital.The Steelers won the toss in overtime and deferred, putting their defense on the field. The defense held, giving the offense the ball with **QB Devlin Hodges** at the helm. Hodges completed a pass to **WR JuJu Smith-Schuster**, who fumbled. The ball was recovered by Marlon Humphrey.

Seattle would run three plays and gain six yards to set up a 46-yard field goal attempt for K Justin Tucker. The Ravens placekicker snuck the ball just inside the left upright and Baltimore secured a 26-23 victory.

**K Chris Boswell** appeared to put the Steelers back in the driver's seat when he hit a 33-yard field goal with 2:37 to play, going up, 23-20. The key play on the drive was when Hodges scrambled and broke free for a 21-yard gain, with a holding call tacked on to the end of it.

However, the Ravens drove down the field at the end of regulation and Tucker tied it with 10 seconds to play, 23-23, to send the game into overtime.

With the game tied at 20-20, a swarming defense completely shut down the Ravens. Buried at their own one-yard line following a punt, they went no further. The Ravens had to punt, and the Steelers took over at Baltimore's 45-yard line.

The Steelers took their first lead of the game despite losing Rudolph in the third quarter.

Rudolph suffered a concussion on third-and-11 from the Steelers' 12-yard line while extending the play and eventually finding **WR James Washington** for a 26-yard gain while absorbing a helmet-to-helmet hit from Ravens safety Earl Thomas III.

A 15-yard roughing-the-passer penalty was tacked on, which gave the Steelers a first-and-10 at the Baltimore 48.

Enter Hodges.

The Steelers' third quarterback of the season hit **WR Diontae Johnson** for 13 yards and **TE Vance McDonald**, this time on a play-action bootleg, for 14 yards to the Baltimore 1. **RB James Conner**, with **LB Tyler Matakevich** at fullback, finished off the 10-play, 87-yard drive in 4:40 with a 1-yard touchdown run. Boswell's extra point made it 20-17 Steelers, with 3:42 left in the third quarter.

The Ravens reached the Steelers' 9 on their next possession but ultimately settled for a 26-yard field goal from Tucker that tied the game at 20-20.

The Steelers scored the final six points of the first half and went to the locker room after two quarters trailing, 17-13.

An interception of a deflected pass and 10-yard return by **S Kameron Kelly** gave the Steelers possession at the Ravens' 16. Kelly was being used periodically a six-defensive backs package on third downs.The Steelers reached the Ravens 7 on the subsequent possession but lost 5 yards on a second-and-1 Wildcat sweep by **RB Jaylen Samuels** and then 11 more when Rudolph was sacked on third-and-6. Boswell salvaged a 41-yard field goal on a scoring drive that lost 7 yards but cut the Ravens' lead to 17-10.Another interception, this one by **CB Mike Hilton**, set the Steelers up at the Ravens' 25 with 33 seconds left prior to halftime. A roughing-the-passer penalty pushed the ball to the 11, where Rudolph threw incomplete into the end zone for Washington.

Boswell's 29-yard field goal on the last play of the first half drew the Steelers to within four at the break.

The Ravens scored on three consecutive possessions after holding the Steelers without a first down on the game's opening possession.

Baltimore went 50 yards in 10 plays after taking over at its 41-yard line following a punt and 2-yard return and concluded the march with a 27-yard field goal by Tucker for a 3-0 lead.

The Steelers' next snap ended on an interception thrown by Samuels on a Wildcat pass for Washington. LB Josh Byrnes' pick set the Ravens up at the Steelers' 15. RB Mark Ingram finished a four-play series with a 4-yard touchdown run for a 10-0 Baltimore lead with 4:48 left in the first quarter.

The Ravens went on 13-play, 65-yard drive in 6:20 that culminated with an 11-yard touchdown pass from QB Lamar Jackson to WR Marquise Brown for a 17-7 Ravens' advantage.

The Jackson-to-Brown scoring strike countered a 35-yard touchdown pass from Rudolph to Smith-Schuster that cut the Steelers' deficit to 10-7. Smith-Schuster hauled in Rudolph's pass at the Baltimore 20 and ran through CB Marlon Humphrey's attempt to hammer the ball from Smith-Schuster's grasp at the Ravens' 10.

**PITTSBURGH** — The Steelers saw a 23-7 halftime lead disappear, falling to the Los Angeles Chargers, 33-30, on a field goal with no time left on the clock.

The loss has the Steelers at 7-4-1, still holding on to first place in the AFC North.

The Chargers had 23 unanswered points in the second half, taking a 30-23 lead.

The Steelers tied it at 30-30 with 4:10 to play when **QB Ben Roethlisberger** connected with **RB Jaylen Samuels** for a 10-yard touchdown.

But the Chargers wouldn't go away. Philip Rivers drove them down to the 21-yard line, where kicker Michael Badgley had three opportunities to make a field goal. His 39-yard attempt went wide left, but **CB Joe Haden** was offside. A 34-yard attempt was blocked by **CB Artie Burns**, who was flagged for offside on the play. The third attempt, a 29-yarder, gave the Chargers the win.

Roethlisberger, who completed 29 of 45 passes for 281 yards, two touchdowns, and an interception, said he should have played better.

Injuries also mounted for the Steelers in the game, including **RB James Conner** leaving in the fourth quarter with a lower leg contusion.

Things looked good for the Steelers early on when they came out with a quick strike on their first drive to take an early lead. Roethlisberger was two for two for 55 yards, all of it to WR Antonio Brown, including a 46-yarder to the one-yard line. Conner punched it in from the one to give the Steelers the 7-0 lead.

A relentless defense got the best of the Chargers on the next possession. **S Terrell Edmunds** stopped Austin Ekeler for no gain, then sacked Rivers for a nine-yard loss. On third down **LB T.J. Watt** brought the pressure, and **CB Mike Hilton** broke up Rivers' pass to force the punt.

The offense stayed hot on the ensuing drive. Roethlisberger hit Brown for 12 yards, Conner added seven yards on two carries. They benefitted greatly by a pass interference call on Michael Davis in the end zone, a 28-yard penalty that gave them the ball at the one-yard line. Conner once again took it in from the one-yard line, extending the lead to 13-0 after **K Chris Boswell** missed the extra point.

The Chargers got on the board on a 46-yard touchdown pass from Rivers to Travis Benjamin on a play where it appeared everyone in Heinz Field except the officials saw RT Sam Tevi move before the play. The play pulled the Chargers to within a score, 13-7.

The Steelers were moving the ball on their next drive, converting on three third downs, and moving the ball down to the Chargers 22-yard line. Roethlisberger threw it up for **TE Vance McDonald**, but Darwin James intercepted it at the eight-yard line and returned it to the 21-yard line after a penalty on the return.

A fired-up defense came after the Chargers on the next series, giving them nowhere to run, and shutting down the pass with tight coverage. And then special teams did their part when LB L.J. Fort blocked the punt, and **S Jordan Dangerfield** recovered at the Chargers 34-yard line.

Roethlisberger couldn't connect with a wide-open Justin Hunter, overthrowing him on what would have been a touchdown. The Steelers had to settle for a 48-yard field goal by Boswell, extending the lead to 16-7.

After another big defensive stop the Steelers got the ball back at the nine-yard line with 1:39 to play. Conner got them out of the hole with a 20-yard run, and a 16-yard completion to **WR JuJu Smith-Schuster** took the ball to the Steelers 49-yard line. A pass interference call gave the Steelers a first down at the 28-yard line. Roethlisberger threw a missile to Brown in the end zone for a 28-yard touchdown, sending them into halftime ahead, 23-7.

The Chargers struck first in the third quarter when Rivers took them on a 13-play, 88-yard drive that ate up 8:07 on the clock. A near interception turned into a touchdown when **S Sean Davis** and Haden collided in the end zone, and the ball bounced into Keenan Allen's hands for the 10-yard touchdown. Rivers hit Antonio Gates on the two-point conversion attempt to cut the lead to 23-15.

After the Steelers offense went three-and-out, the Chargers special teams came up huge. Desmond King returned the punt 73 yards for a touchdown, and Rivers connected with Allen for the two-point conversion to tie the game, 23-23.

The Chargers took their first lead of the game in the fourth quarter on a seven-play, 79-yard drive, that culminated in an 18-yard touchdown run by Justin Jackson to go ahead, 30-23.

With their backs against the wall the offense got on a roll. On a fourth-and-one, Conner took it for two yards to move the chains. A personal foul call on a hit on **WR Ryan Switzer** gave the Steelers another first down. Roethlisberger hit Conner for 10 yards, but he was hurt on the play and helped off the field. Samuels came in and Roethlisberger hit him for a 10-yard touchdown to tie the game, 30-30.

Badgley's 29-yard field goal, with no time on the clock, gave the Chargers the 33-30 win.
