ROOKIE EVENTS

The Steelers 2024 Rookie class were introduced to the Pittsburgh community through a week of community events that started with assisting Urban Impact at their annual Youth Football Clinic. Next, they paid a visit to the Best of the Batch Foundation to work with their youth on STEM related projects and computer science education with The Bus Stops Here Foundation and their CyberBus. Their last stop was to Mel Blount's Youth Home where they spoke with the youth about their journey to the NFL before participating in football drills.

PAVING THE WAY

For the second consecutive season, The Pavement Group and the Pittsburgh Steelers partnered together in support of the 'Paving the Way' program. For every field goal and extra point that the Steelers offense recorded this season (including preseason and postseason), The Pavement Group donated \$500 per field goal and \$100 per extra point to The Heyward House. The Heyward House, founded in 2015 by Steelers defensive end and 2023 Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year Cam Heyward, is dedicated to impacting the lives of today's youth by providing programs, outreach and smiles to countless children in need. With 43 field goals and 39 extra points in the 2024 season, \$25,400 was donated to The Heyward House. Over the past two seasons, The Pavement Group has donated over \$45,000 to local charitable organizations.

STEELERS STEM

Steelers STEM is the exclusive provider of an online platform at no cost for middle schools across Western Pennsylvania. This platform enables students with the opportunity to explore the fields of STEM - Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math - in an interactive and engaging way. Since 2019, over 20,000 students have completed the online curriculum.

As part of the Steelers STEM program, the annual Powering Pittsburgh Championships was held at Acrisure Stadium in November. Students from across Western Pennsylvania proposed concepts to power the city of Pittsburgh and Acrisure Stadium in ways that were energy efficient, environmentally sound, and economically viable. The competition's top three teams earned monetary donations to enhance STEM learning initiatives at their schools, thanks to the support of the program's three partners.

GREATER PITTSBURGH COMMUNITY FOODBANK

The Pittsburgh Steelers 2024 Rookie Class visited the Greater Pittsburgh Community Foodbank for a tour of the facility and to learn more how the food bank is working to increase access to nutritious food for the community. To wrap up their visit, they helped pack over 1,000 pounds of fresh produce that was distributed to communities in need.

In November, the Pittsburgh Steelers teamed up with the Pittsburgh Penguins and Pittsburgh Pirates for the fourth annual BurghProud food distribution. The teams came together to support over 300 community members with turkeys, thanksgiving fixings, team swag and more!

Coach Tomlin continues to partner with the Greater Pittsburgh Community Foodbank to host his annual holiday distribution at Pittsburgh Faison. Coach Tomlin, joined by his wife Kiya, helped to pass out over 200 meals for families in the Homewood community.



THE 51st ANNUAL ART ROONEY AWARDS DINNER

This year Catholic Youth Association hosted the 51st Art Rooney Award Dinner at Acrisure Stadium. The annual event honors Pittsburgh leaders in business, education, and the community that have shown leadership, outstanding work in media and service. Pouncey sponsored the tailgate and tickets during his time with the team. Minkah Fitzpatrick has taken over the program and continues to sponsor this program to continue to cultivate stronger relationships between police and youth.



MEETING AT THE 50 Yard line

For the fourth year in a row, the Pittsburgh Steelers social justice committee partnered with the Neighborhood Resilience Project to meet with local high school students to discuss ways to deescalate violence in and out of school. Players take part in intimate conversations where they discuss violence, they may have experienced and work with students to discuss alternate ways to address situations that can lead to positive outcomes.

This year, players visited Penn Hills High School, Sto-Rock High School and Perry Traditional Academy.







YOUTH JUSTICE ACTION MONTH

Youth Justice Action Month is an annual campaign where advocates come together to organize digital and in-person events and activities to raise awareness and inspire action on behalf of young people impacted by the justice system. The Pittsburgh Steelers Social Justice Committee hosted a panel discussion with local community partners in recognition of Youth Justice Action Month. Elandon Roberts and Calvin Austin III moderated the discussion which featured youth from participating organizations alongside Kevin Richardson of the Exonerated Five. The panelists shared their personal experiences in a moving discussion about the juvenile justice system in America. Among the organizations who took part in the event were Amachi Pittsburgh, Café Momentum, Gwen's Girls and Homeless Children's Education Fund, who all had students on the panel, as well as Action Housing, Auberle, Boys & Girls Club of Western Pa., PA Innocence Project, Pittsburgh Public Schools and The Heyward House.

SOCIAL JUSTICE FUND

The annual Steelers Social Justice Matching Fund encourages players to donate to community organizations focused on social and economic justice, with their contributions being matched by the Steelers organization.

Since its inception in 2018, the team and its players have donated \$2,994,970 combined to benefit 82 charitable organizations throughout the region. This year the team made a total of \$516,000 in donations, with the players contributing \$258,000. Donations were made by over half of the team's roster which included \$100,000 from Defensive Captain Cam Heyward and \$50,000 from Offensive Captain Russell Wilson.













ED BLOCK COURAGE AWARD



As a rookie, Cory Trice Jr. battled an injury sustained during his first week of training camp. He returned this season in Week 2 before sustaining another injury during the home opener. Focusing on coming back and making plays has helped him overcome his injuries. He was presented with the award by Coach Tomlin at the Courage House Luncheon at Acrisure Stadium.

The Courage House Luncheon benefits Holy Family Institute in their continued work in providing support through community programs, education, and energy assistance.

He worked with the kids to create remembrance candles to honor their loved ones.

The next day, Heyward, along with his brother, Connor, visited UPMC Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh where they spent time with the patient's playing games, participating in activities together, and providing each patient with a blanket.

Kindness Week continued as Heyward hosted his annual Teacher Appreciation Dinner at Acrisure Stadium, giving back to those who do so much for the youth in the community. The group of teachers were treated to a tour of the Hall of Honor Museum, and then Heyward joined them for dinner to announce a donation for each of their classroom projects.

To wrap up 'Cam's Kindness Week' on Friday by hosting student flag and tackle football athletes from Pittsburgh Obama to watch the Steelers practice. He surprised the group with a \$15,000 donation to upgrade their locker room and to support the girls flag football team.

STEELERS SPONSOR GIRLS High school football Flag football

The Pittsburgh Steelers sponsored the third season of the girl's high school flag football program in the spring of 2024. The program grew from the pilot program with six schools to thirty-six high schools.

The season lasted six weeks where the teams played two games each Sunday afternoon and culminated in a championship tournament at Carnegie Mellon University on May 19. Steelers legends Troy Polamalu and Will Allen were there to help crown the back-to-back Moon Area Tigers as the 2024 Champions.

STEELERS HOST AND BROADCAST WPIAL CHAMPIONSHIP GAMES AT ACRISURE STADIUM

Acrisure Stadium has long been the host site of WPIAL Championship Games, but in 2024, the Steelers also broadcast the games on KDKA+. With the support of 84 Lumber, Acrisure, Giant Eagle and Spead Group, the Steelers produced the Class 1A, 2A, 3A, and 5A games.

Each game had a Steelers player serve as an honorary captain including current Steelers Beanie Bishop, Pat Freiermuth and Steelers legends Charlie Batch and Vince Williams.

YOUTH FOOTBALL

STEELERS YOUTH FOOTBALL CAMPS

The Pittsburgh Steelers were able to host four Youth Football Camps in June and July.

The Camps are two days long and offer instruction from past Coach of the Week winners. We were at 100% capacity with 800 campers, and welcomed kids from 20 states, including Arizona and Texas.

Current Steelers Beanie Bishop, Chris Boswell, Jeremiah Moon and Ryan Watts were joined by Legends Charlie Batch, Terence Garvin, Arthur Moats, Derek Moye, Roosevelt Nix, Shaun Suisham, Vince Williams, and Craig Wolfley.





USA FOOTBALL COACHING CERTIFICATION

The Pittsburgh Steelers continue to underwrite the costs for local youth and high school football coaching certification. The Steelers work with USA Football to secure a Steelers discount code, and then provide that code to local football programs to cover 50% of their training.

The Steelers hosted 112 coaches at Acrisure Stadium for an inperson certification and 947 for online certifications. In total, the Steelers supported more than 1,200+ coaches overall in 2024.

STEELERS PHYS-ED

The Steelers Youth Football Phys-Ed program visited several schools to incorporate football fun into their physical education class.

The visit featured some football drills, agility drills, and some NFL Flag Football training. The PhysEd program visited five schools in 2024 to pilot the program and impacted 1,146 kids.





STEELERS YOUTH FOOTBALL CO-CAPTAINS

The Steelers welcomed 18 area youth football players, including two girls flag players, who served as our Youth Football Co-Captains for each Steelers home game.

Area youth football programs select two players to receive the honor, and we host the players and two guests with pregame field passes and tickets to the game.

The youth players also join our captains for the coin toss. They are featured on our video board during the toss and recognized on our Steelers youth football social channels.




FLAG FOOTBALL

GIRLS HIGH SCHOOL FLAG KICKOFF

The Steelers kicked off the third season of Girls High School Flag Football on April 7th with a jersey unveiling hype video that introduced new teams who joined the Steelers Spring Season.

The Steelers paid for one set of uniforms for 19 new onboarding teams, including flag equipment. Each team received a set of 25 jerseys and shorts.

YOUTH TACKLE FOOTBALL AT HALFTIME

The Steelers hosted the Gateway Gators and Plum Mustangs youth tackle organizations to the preseason game on August 17th against the Buffalo Bills.

Each team provided one player to serve as the honorary youth cocaptain for the game.

Players and coaches from the two youth teams also sat in the on-field seats in the Northeast corner of the stadium.





GIRLS FLAG FOOTBALL AT HALFTIME

In 2024, the Steelers hosted four High School Girls Flag teams (Upper St. Clair, North Catholic, Brashear, and Westinghouse) to play at halftime of our preseason game against the Texans on August 9th.

Upper St. Clair and Westinghouse provided one girl from their team to serve as our honorary co-captains for the game.

LOVE FOR THE GAME

NFL FLAG FOOTBALL SPRING SEASON

The Steelers continued to provide FREE NFL Flag Football to tackle football organizations in the spring. The spring season allows kids to play flag but not at the expense of playing tackle, while also building relationships with tackle football organizations. This approach has shown an increase in tackle participation in these organizations' fall tackle seasons.

In 2024, we provided this program to 567 kids from Urban Impact (126) Carlynton (78), Lower Burrell (110), Springdale (53), and Thomas Jefferson (200).

We drove a growth of 33% from 2023, when we had 427 kids.





NFL FLAG SUPER REGIONAL

The Steelers hosted their NFL Flag Super Regional on June 2nd, at Bethel Park High School. The event had over 50 NFL Flag teams consisting of teams across 13 different divisions and 500+ youth players in attendance.

The 13 division champions will represent the Steelers at the NFL Flag Championships in Canton in July.

NFL FLAG CHAMPIONSHIPS AT PRO BOWL GAMES

Steelers Youth Football social provided coverage for the three international markets in the Steelers market including Mexico, Germany and Ireland.

The Steelers provided 140 hats to NFL Flag teams competing in the Championships at the 2024 Pro Bowl from the International Bracket.





DONATIONS & SUPPORT

STEELERS BANQUET KEYNOTE SPEAKER

The Steelers started a new banquet keynote speaker series in 2024. A current or former Steeler goes out to a youth or high school football banquet to share some encouraging and valuable words about their experiences. We will participate in 4-8 banquets following the 2024 season.

WILLIE PARKER FOOTBALL TEAM

Former Steelers running back, Willie Parker is the coach of a youth football team in North Carolina. The Steelers helped with the burden of travel costs from North Carolina to Naples by donating \$5,000 to compete in the National Championship in Naples, FL in December.

SUPER BOWL TICKETS

In 2024, the Steelers surprised long-time head coach of the Rochester Rams, Gene Matsook, with two tickets to Super Bowl LIX to support and thank him for his years as a high school football coach. Gene coached for 39 years, 25 years as a head coach at the same school. Rochester won 4 district titles as well as 2 state championships with Coach Matsook at the helm.

WEIGHT ROOM UPGRADES

To make a big impact in the community - not just with football or athletics, The Steelers remodeled their entire team weight room in 2024 and donated all the previous equipment to six local high schools. Deer Lakes, Chartiers Valley, Cornell, Penn Hills, Imani Christian Academy, Baldwin

The festivities include a visit to the UPMC Rooney Sports Complex followed by a fundraising dinner on Saturday night to benefit the UPMC Sports Medicine Concussion Program. The dinner event is highlighted by the alumni sharing stories of their playing days and a silent auction. On Steelers game day, the players are introduced to the fans at halftime for a wonderful homecoming.

In 2024, players from the team's Super Bowl IX team were welcomed back to enjoy Pittsburgh and their former teammates once again.

HALL OF HONOR

The Pittsburgh Steelers Hall of Honor, established with its inaugural class of 27 members in 2017, is comprised of former players, coaches, and front office personnel who were integral in creating and sustaining the franchise's success dating back to when the team was founded in 1933. The new members are officially inducted at a fundraising dinner to benefit the Chuck Noll Foundation for Brain Injury Research, then recognized at halftime of the next day's game.

A LASTING LEGACY

ONCE A STEELER, ALWAYS A STEELER

Nothing ever replaces the feeling of the locker room or a gameday for a player, but our current players and fans are fortunate to see several former Steelers around at various events visiting with each other and the current team. This includes visits to Organized Team Activities (OTAs), Training Camp, gamedays, and supporting each other's various philanthropic events throughout the year.





BEST OF THE BATCH Foundation

Best of the Batch was founded in 1999 by former Steelers QB Charlie Batch to give back to his hometown of Homestead, Pa. It works to unlock potential in communities to build the best future for kids and families, annually serving more than 4,000 school-age children in South Western Pennsylvania. Best of the Batch celebrated their 25th birthday in 2024, celebrating 25 years of teamwork and community building.

Out of School Time programming provides children the freedom to explore their interests through computer play, art projects, outdoor activities and STEAM based lessons. A state-ofthe-art STEAM Lab encourages engagement in math and science, reaching academic goals, and discovering career opportunities. There are also ways for the kids to sit back and relax with various gaming areas and go home with a belly full of warm food.

BatchPacks annually distributes backpacks to 2,500 area kids, with supplies needed for a successful school year. The Foundation also provides bags to teachers with basic items for their classroom. In April we provided adopted



800 middle school students and gave them hygiene kits with daily essentials at their fingertips.

Batch-A-Toys is a holiday assistance program where the Foundation "adopts" Southwestern Pa. families, providing toys, household items, and a holiday meal basket. The presents are hand-delivered on Christmas Eve. In 2024, we adopted over 400 families which touched over 1,800 children.

Most daily Foundation programming occurs in the Clubhouse. The 33,000 sq. foot facility is the home of Camp Batch, their summer day camp combating summer learning loss for over 200 kids. The rookies join in on Camp Batch festivities every year, showing the kids teamwork skills and bonding over crafts and activities.

WILL ALLEN FOUNDATION

The Will Allen Foundation (WAF) provides programs and resources to instill hope, remove barriers, promote education, advocate civic responsibility, and change lives in the community. Programs include Quest for Real Life Success, a four-year program to prepare high school students for future success through career development, college readiness and life skills.

A grant from Richard King Mellon Foundation enabled the Foundation to add a fourth school to the Quest program. Quest is now in Clairton, Perry and North Hills High Schools and The Neighborhood Academy. WAF added curriculum in financial literacy, social justice, and AI.

Forty students from Clairton High School and the Neighborhood Academy received micro-certifications in robotics.

Students from The Neighborhood Academy held a Community Slam at Boys and Girls Clubs Lawrenceville Clubhouse. They tackled issues such as gun violence, food insecurity and community economic challenges. Their efforts included a food drive for Pittsburgh Community Food Banks. As a result, they received a gold trophy in the Multiplying Good Students in Action program and attended the national competition at Howard University.

The Holiday Giving Program supports families that are paying 50% or more of their income on housing. Each year community and corporate volunteers and students and alumni from the Quest Program take a group of children shopping for their own families and every child goes home with a special surprise for themselves.

ROCKY BLEIER A HEART FOR VETERANS

Steelers and US Army veteran Rocky Bleier, who overcame a debilitating war injury to become a four-time Super Bowl champion, has a heart for helping fellow veterans. Not only does he support numerous veterans-related causes, but he is also one of the owners and managing members of RBVetCo., a service-disabled, veteran-owned company. It specializes in the construction of commercial buildings, additions and renovations including planning, design, scheduling, value engineering and sub-contracting.

A Purple Heart recipient, Rocky is serving as the spokesperson of Project Purple Heart, which is encouraging the establishment of a database of Purple Heart recipients in conjunction with 2022 anniversaries of the medal. He annually participates in the Steelers' Salute to Service game and activities, and in 2023 surprised fellow Vietnam Veteran Petty Officer Michael E. McCarthy with an autographed jersey.

In 2024, Rocky was the Steelers nominee for the NFL's Salute to Service Award, which recognizes people who support the military community.

JEROME BETTIS BUS Stops here foundation

The Jerome Bettis Bus Stops Here Foundation was created in 1997 by Pro Football Hall of Fame running back Jerome Bettis to provide inner-city youth with opportunities and resources to succeed and become healthy, confident, and productive individuals in today's society.

Check-Inn is a virtual program designed to engage impoverished middle school students through engaging, exciting, and stimulating activities based on innovation and technology, entrepreneurship, film, video, art, science and more. Participants virtually check-in to enjoy and experience enrichment, educational and other activities that keep them engaged after school and during summer breaks.

Innovation Huddle is designed to give all children exposure and access to STEM and computer science programs. They are provided with coding classes, tech and innovation coaching along with summer innovation and technology camp.

The W.O.W. CyberBus mobile classroom provides out-of-school time classes in computer science education to students in grades K-8 as well as digital literacy and business development classes to parents.

Recognizing that the digital division is leading to an educational crisis among students, Connected Kids is meant to connect as many underprivileged children and youth as possible with educational resources and technology. The foundation requests generous donations of technology devices like used computers and laptops from individuals and companies and donate them to the less fortunate students so that they continue with their learning and develop their skills in this digital era.

The annual Holiday Toy Drive provides gifts for underprivileged children.

In June, The Bus Stops Here Foundation Cyber Bus visited the Best of the Batch Clubhouse along with the Steelers Rookies to participate in STEM coding activities and a catapult building competition.

NEL BLOUNT YOUTH LEADERSHIP INITIATIVE

Hall of Famer Mel Blount runs the Mel Blount Youth Leadership Initiative (MBYLI), which works to provide youth with programs where they will have a healthy environment to learn, work, play and to develop principles of respect, responsibility, and leadership through nurturing, moral and character development and guidance.

In 2020 MBYLI launched the Building Champions program to focus on the well-rounded development of student athletes and all youth. Mel shares with student athletes the values that helped him be successful on and off the field. The first annual Building Champions Camp in July 2021, included Pittsburgh-area high school football teams assisting in field skills, exposing students to the outdoors and horses, and team building on the ropes course. Guest speakers stressed the value of education and what is required to ascend to higher education. The Steelers and Tickets for Kids provided tickets to the Steelers preseason game to young scholars from the program.

The MBYLI Golf Tournament, held in July 2024 at Longue View Club, supported scholarships and the Building Champions program.

MBYLI hosts an annual All-Star Celebrity Roast, and in 2024, Steelers Hall of Fame coach Bill Cowher was honored.

The Pittsburgh Steelers and individual players supported MBYLI through the Pittsburgh Steelers Social Justice Fund.

MBYLI and Central Baptist Church supplied hundreds of kids with toys for Christmas as a part of the annual MBYLI toy drive.

The Steelers Rookie Class makes an annual trip to visit with kids and participate in the program with Mel and his staff.

ROBERT GOLDEN Golden Charter Academy

In August 2021, Golden Charter Academy (GCA) opened its doors to over 200 students in grades TK-3 in Fresno, Calif. Robert Golden, former Pittsburgh Steeler is the founder & CEO of the Golden Charter Academy (GCA), the nation's first TK-8 Environmental Stewardship Zoo School. The Fresno Chaffee Zoo is the school's founding partner and serves as an extension of their classroom Monday through Friday.

Golden Charter Academy provides students with hands-on learning experiences that will help engage their curiosity and development to becoming environmental stewards. All students at GCA have participated in community action - planting trees, building sea turtle habitats, and planting more than 100 milkweed plants to restore the monarch butterflies to the central valley. GCA's educational approach has given students the opportunity to provide protection to the natural environment and make the planet more sustainable.

The GCA was featured on the front page of Forbes magazine, LA Times, and other media outlets for the development of our young conservationists. The school currently serves grade levels TK-3 and is expanding a grade level every year until it becomes TK-8.

Robert Golden wants all students to succeed academically and in life. Robert's last name could not have been more fitting for his new position in life. Students are required to follow the GOLDEN Rule which stands for: G - Give Respect, O -Obligation, L - Love Learning, D - Dedication, E - Elevate, N - Never Quit.

SANTONIO HOLMES III (Third) & Long Foundation

Founded by Santonio Holmes in the fall of 2011, the mission of the III & Long Foundation is to raise awareness to help fight Sickle Cell Disease (SCD) and provide financial support and treatment options for families affected by the disease. The foundation is named in honor of Holmes' son, Santonio (TJ) Holmes III, who was diagnosed with SCD as a child.

In addition, III & Long Foundation connects regularly with UPMC Children's Hospital to produce special programs and educational services that unite and support the SCD community, including tutoring services for children during hospital treatment, educational seminars for parents, social media awareness campaign #GreaterThanSickleCell, and Thanksgiving and Christmas holiday community events.

JON KOLB Adventures in Training with a Purpose

Former Steelers offensive lineman and coach Jon Kolb founded Adventures in Training with a Purpose (ATP) to confront health and movement-related issues in vulnerable populations with chronic pain and disease. These individuals are largely underserved due to the lack of insurance coverage for long-term care. ATP seeks to restore quality of life and reduce painful movement through Functional Mobility Wellness Training which incorporates strength and aerobics to improve balance and stability while incorporating sensory integration and motor skill development activities.

Many of those training with ATP are veterans, active military, or first responders. ATP is dedicated to improving their lives through purposeful physical training, empowering them with freedom to move and perform tasks of daily living without the need of assistance. ATP also believes that adventure empowers the soul. In addition to training with ATP, clients can go on adventures such as rock climbing, hiking, and more.

ATP serves more than 100 individuals suffering from ALS, Parkinson's, MS, spinal cord injury and cognitive development disorders. In addition to physical and neurological conditions, ATP also works with those dealing with anxiety, depression, and PTS. Adventures were expanded across the globe, including teams of individuals climbing to the summit of Mount Kilimanjaro and a journey through the Grand Canyon.

CHUCK NOLL FOUNDATION

The Steelers launched the Chuck Noll Foundation for Brain Injury Research in 2016 to support continued research and education regarding brain injuries and treatment of sports-related concussions. The foundation funds research that it believes is the most promising in the area of sports-related concussions and related conditions. To help best evaluate which research programs to fund, some of the most renowned neurosurgeons in the country serve on a national medical advisory panel. Steelers legends Merril Hoge and Jerome Bettis serve on the board of directors. Proceeds from the annual Steelers Rock Steelers Style and Hall of Honor dinner at Acrisure Stadium support the mission of the foundation.

In 2023, the Chuck Noll Foundation supported the launch of the National Sports Brain Bank at the University of Pittsburgh and also hosted the second annual golf outing in September at the Club at Nevillewood.

This past June, the foundation announced grants geared towards improving the diagnosis, treatment and prevention of brain injuries resulting from sports related activities. Foundation grants were awarded in both clinical and basic science for a total of \$500,000.

After struggling to find resources to help them care for her, they established the Jasmine Nyree Day Center in their hometown of Bakersfield, Calif. in 2003. The center served special needs children ages 5 to 12 until 2008 when they expanded to include young adults up to 21.

In June 2021, the Porters opened the Jasmine Nyree Campus (JNC) in Pittsburgh's Sheraden neighborhood after renovating long-vacant buildings in the community. The center provides resources for the community as well as for adults 21 and over with developmental issues. JNC also partners with the City of Pittsburgh on economic development plans for the area.

A Giant Eagle Mobile Market stops by the campus every Friday morning to help address the food desert for the community, many of whom don't have transportation to go grocery shopping.

In June, the Joey Porter Sr. & Joey Porter Jr. Celebrity Golf Classic was held at Treesdale Golf & Country Club to help raise funds for the programs.

RYAN SHAZIER Fund for Spinal Rehabilitation

When former Steelers linebacker Ryan Shazier suffered his life-altering spinal cord injury (SCI), his eyes were opened to the challenges and barriers SCI patients face in their road to recovery. This led him to start the Ryan Shazier Fund for Spinal Rehabilitation with the mission of giving those with SCI and their caregivers the support, resources and funding they need to live independent and meaningful lives. The Fund is raising awareness through Shalieve Stories. The stories showcase the inspirational journeys of those facing their spinal cord injury challenges with courage and determination as Ryan did. Ryan shares his story in the book "Walking Miracle," released in November 2021.

The Fund's signature fundraising event, "Run for the Black and Gold," was held in May at Acrisure Stadium. The mock horse racing event features great food, music, live auction and appearances by current and former Steelers in support of Ryan.

The JSF assists academically gifted, deserving students from diverse economic circumstances. Many of these students do not have the financial means to attend college and are often denied the opportunity to develop their full potential. Since its inception, the Foundation has awarded more than \$550,000 in scholarship awards.
